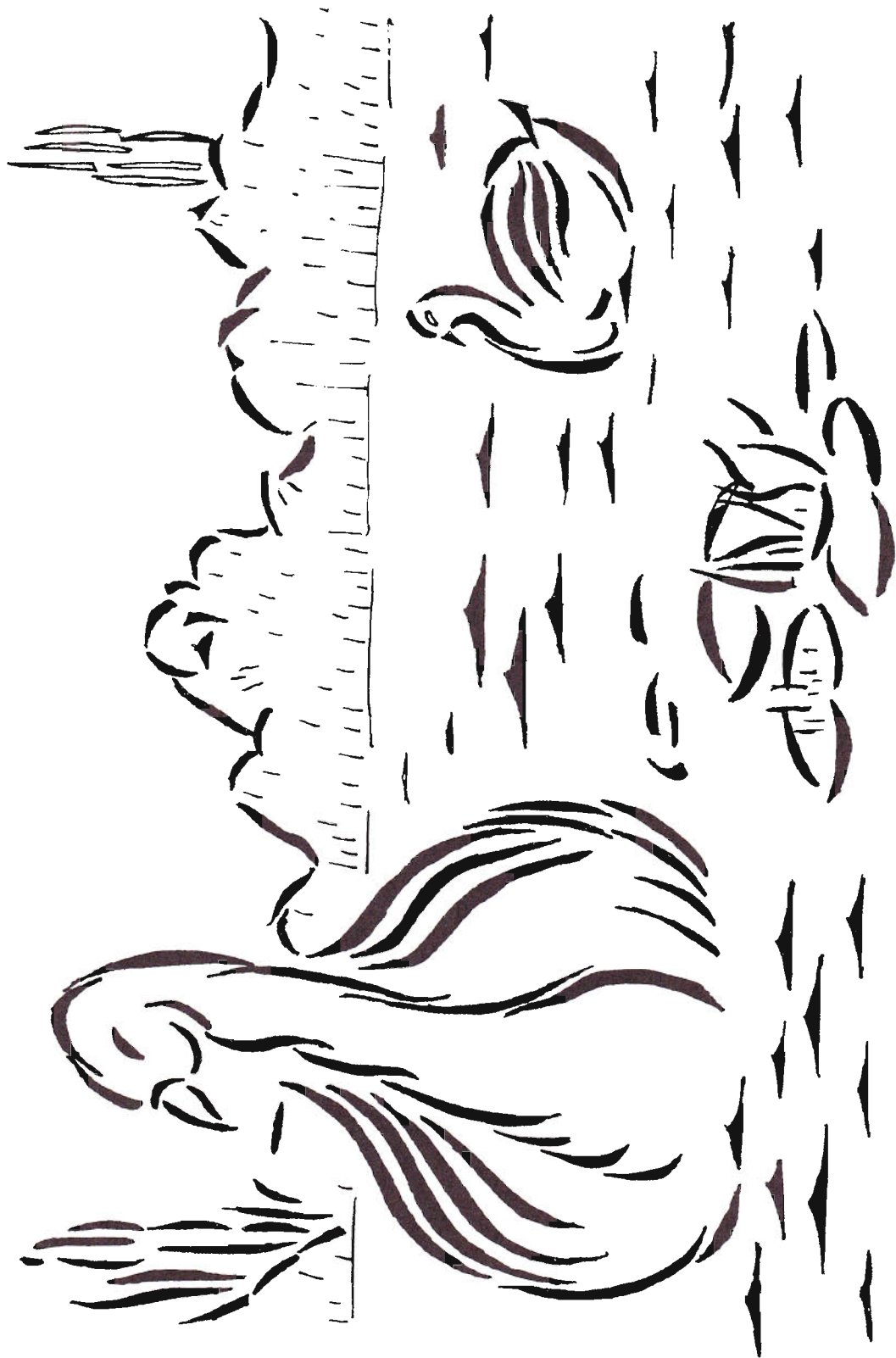
*Every mouse needs a pad ... every computer needs a mouse ...
carve one of these to hang in your computer room!*

Dubbed "Dennis' Eagle", this guy first appeared in our Spring '95 *Chipping Away Newsletter*. Nadia Kowalyshn won a 'name the project' contest for her entry "Carpe Diem"Latin for Seize the Day!

Use the small Moor Chip Carving Knife for those tiny chips along the wings, neck and legs.



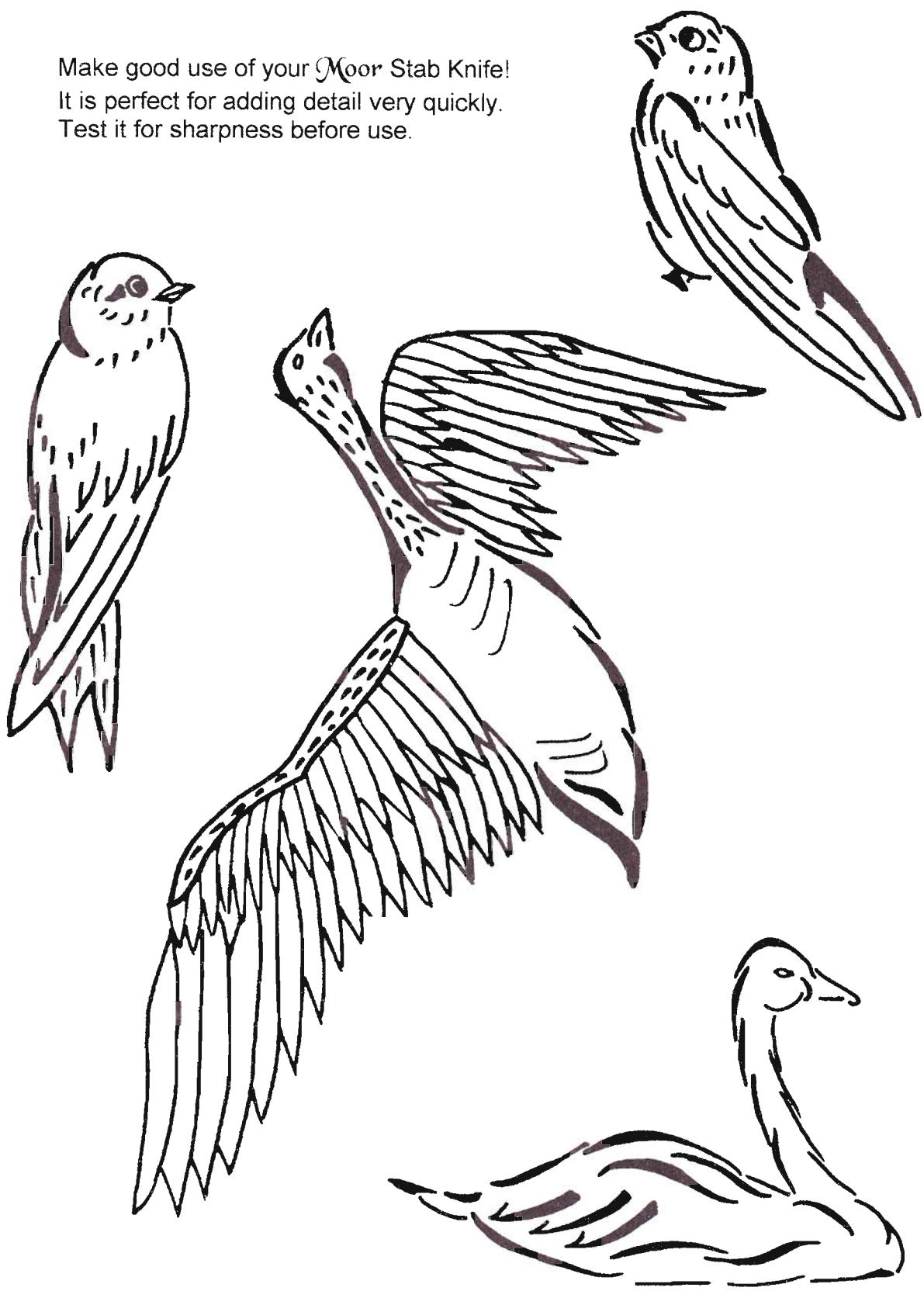
For the eye you may want to try this...
.....drill a hole and insert a 1/8" dowel
then cut it off flush with the surface.
I would suggest a clear polyurethane
finish on this project to accent all of
the sharp ridges. You will find that the
end grain of the dowel will appear
darker than the rest. Nice effect!



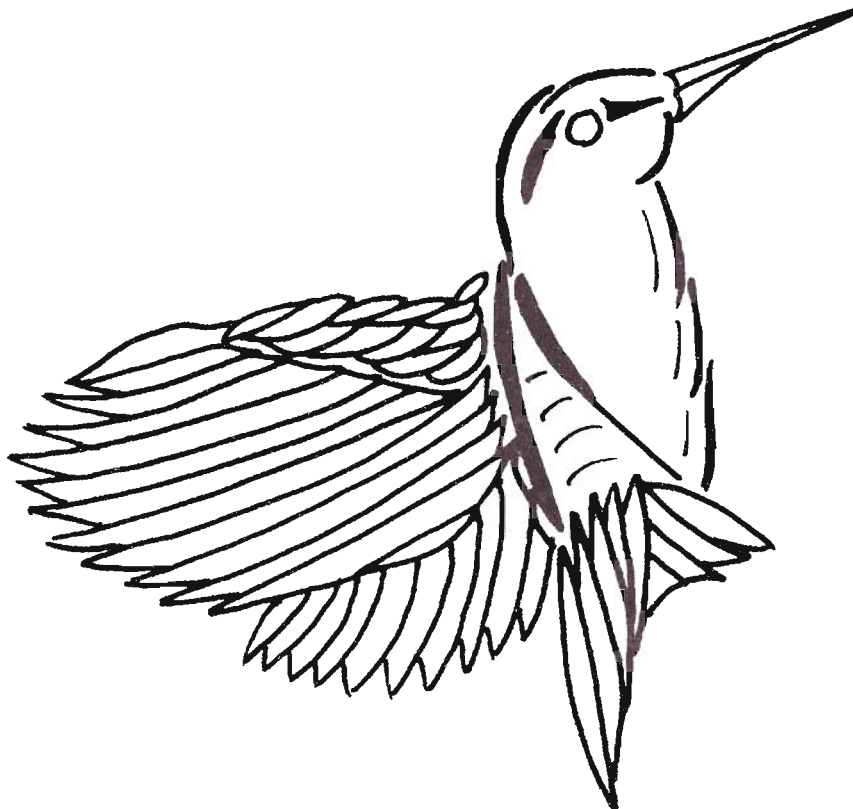
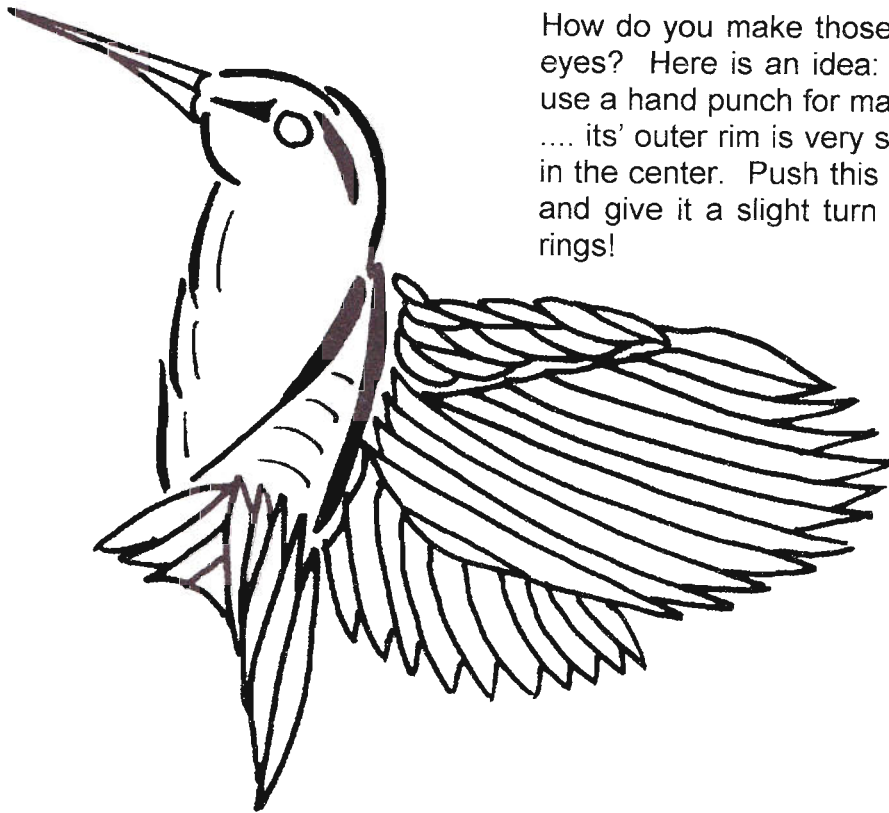


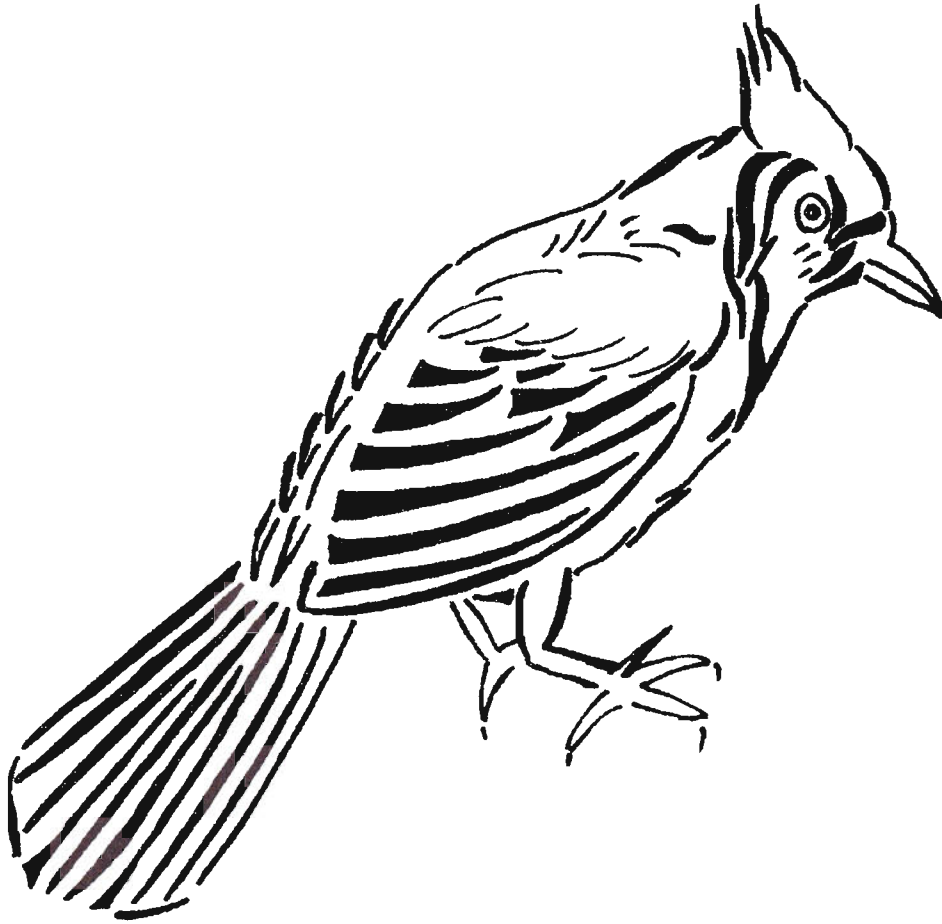
Ducks make a great carving for those 'sportsmen' in your life. Use them on top of a jewelry box or for a decorative wall plaque. Remember to add a carved border how about putting in some water (see previous page with the swans for an idea) and maybe even a few bulrushes or cattails (see flower section).

Make good use of your Moor Stab Knife!
It is perfect for adding detail very quickly.
Test it for sharpness before use.



How do you make those little rings for the eyes? Here is an idea: leather hobbyists use a hand punch for making holes in belts its' outer rim is very sharp and concave in the center. Push this tool into the wood and give it a slight turn makes perfect rings!

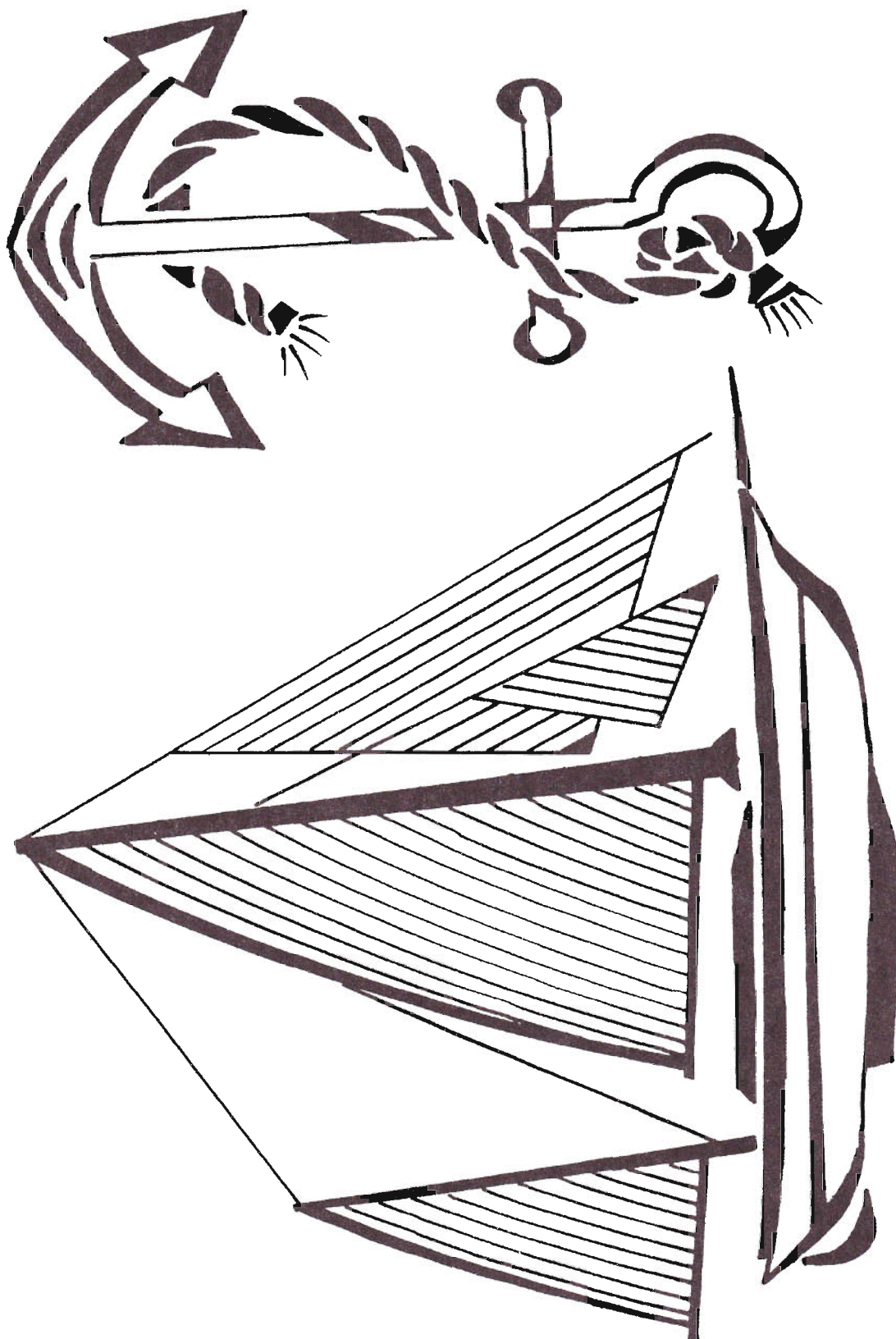




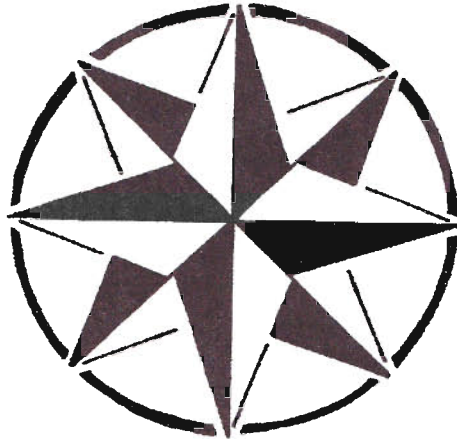
This tall ship looks really great when it is carved see photo at back of the book! Do something with the larger flaghow about an initial?



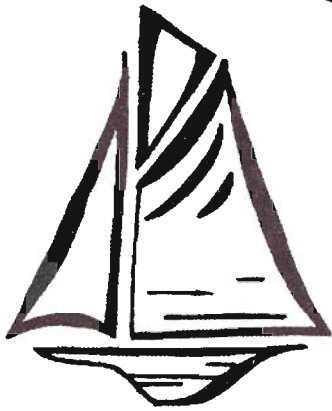
carve out all this black area - leaving only sharp ridges as in photo, or just carve the lines themselves.



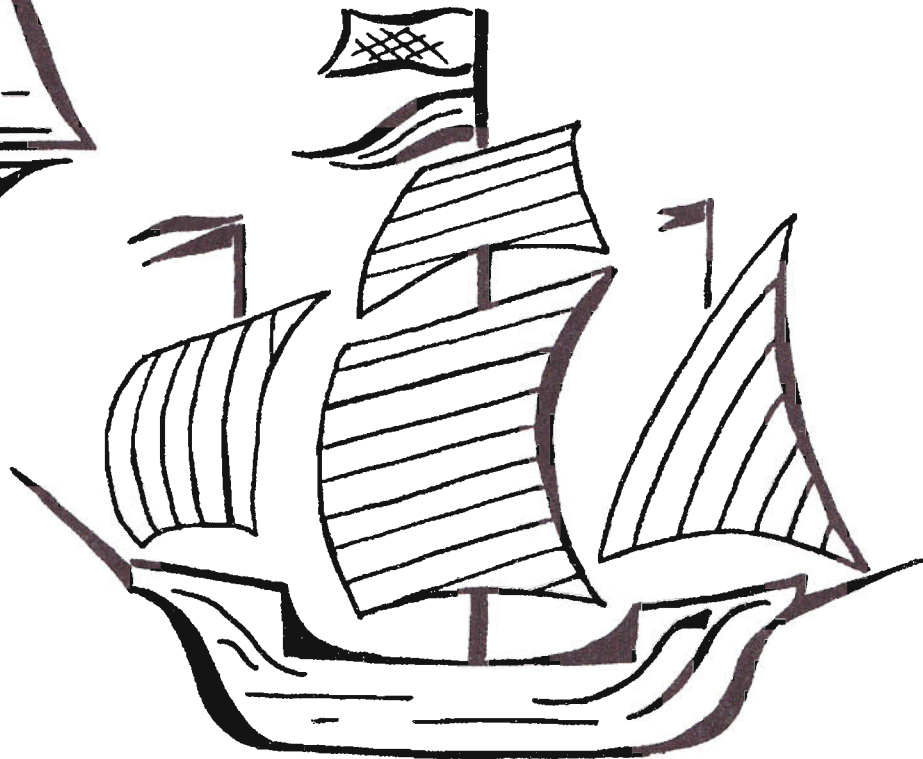

This sail boat is small so we could fit it on the page take it down to your local photocopy store and have it blown up to size you want.



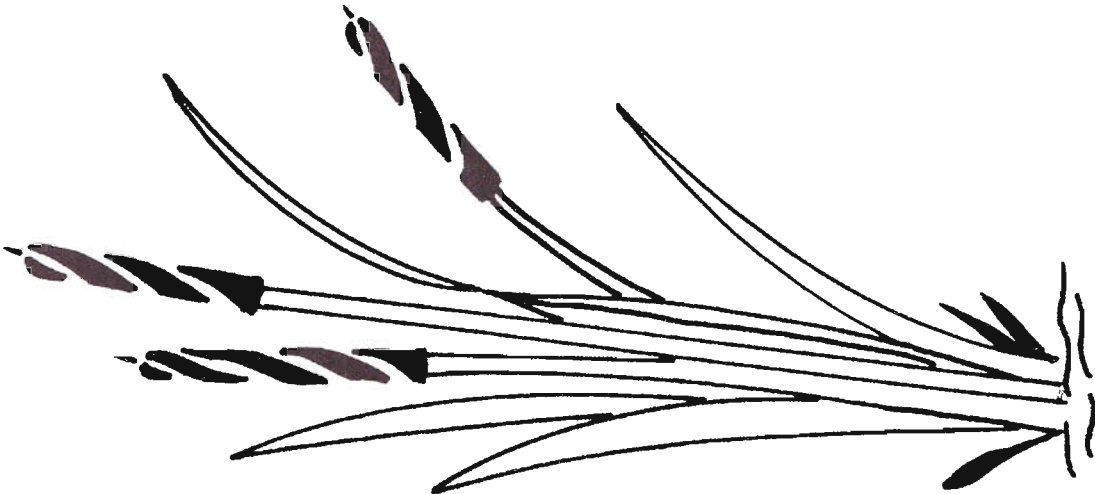
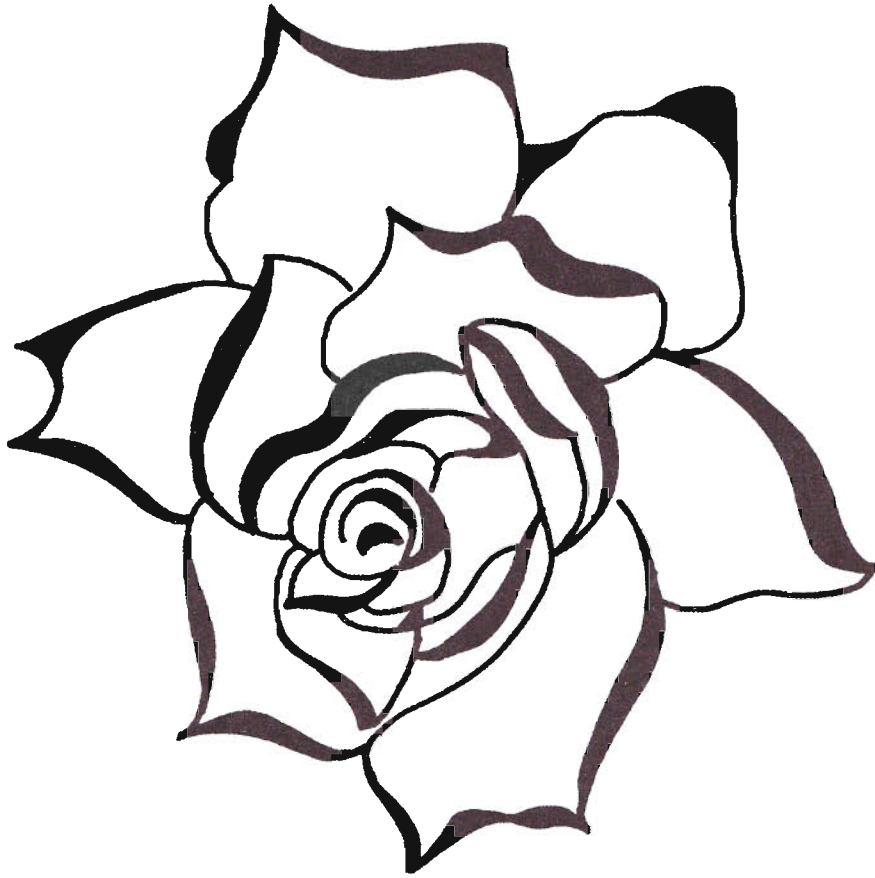


This pontset ...errr, pointset ...err,

see photo at back of book!



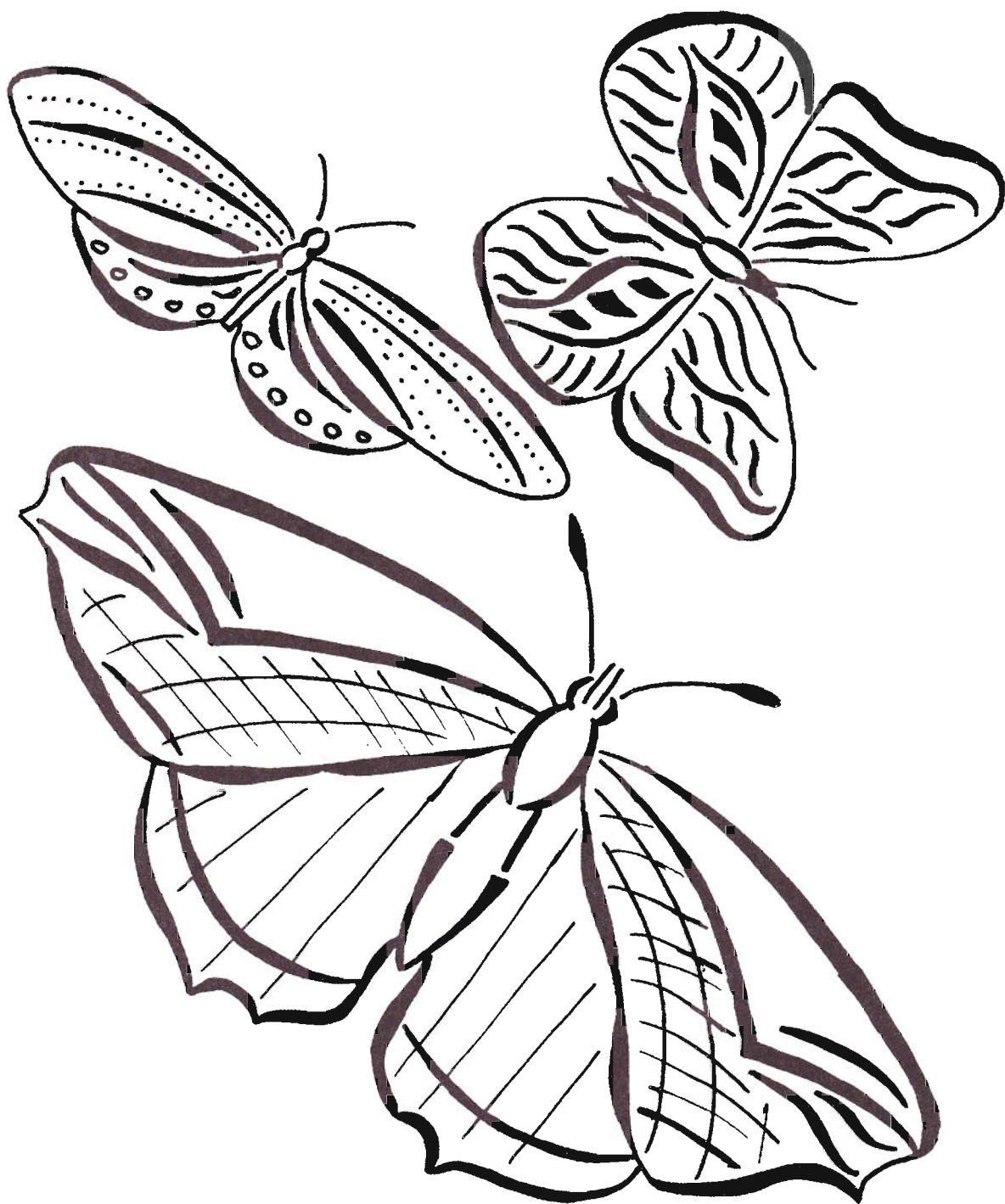




Lily of the Valley: I know someone name Lily, but I will never tell you who she is cause last time, she got very, very upset with me.

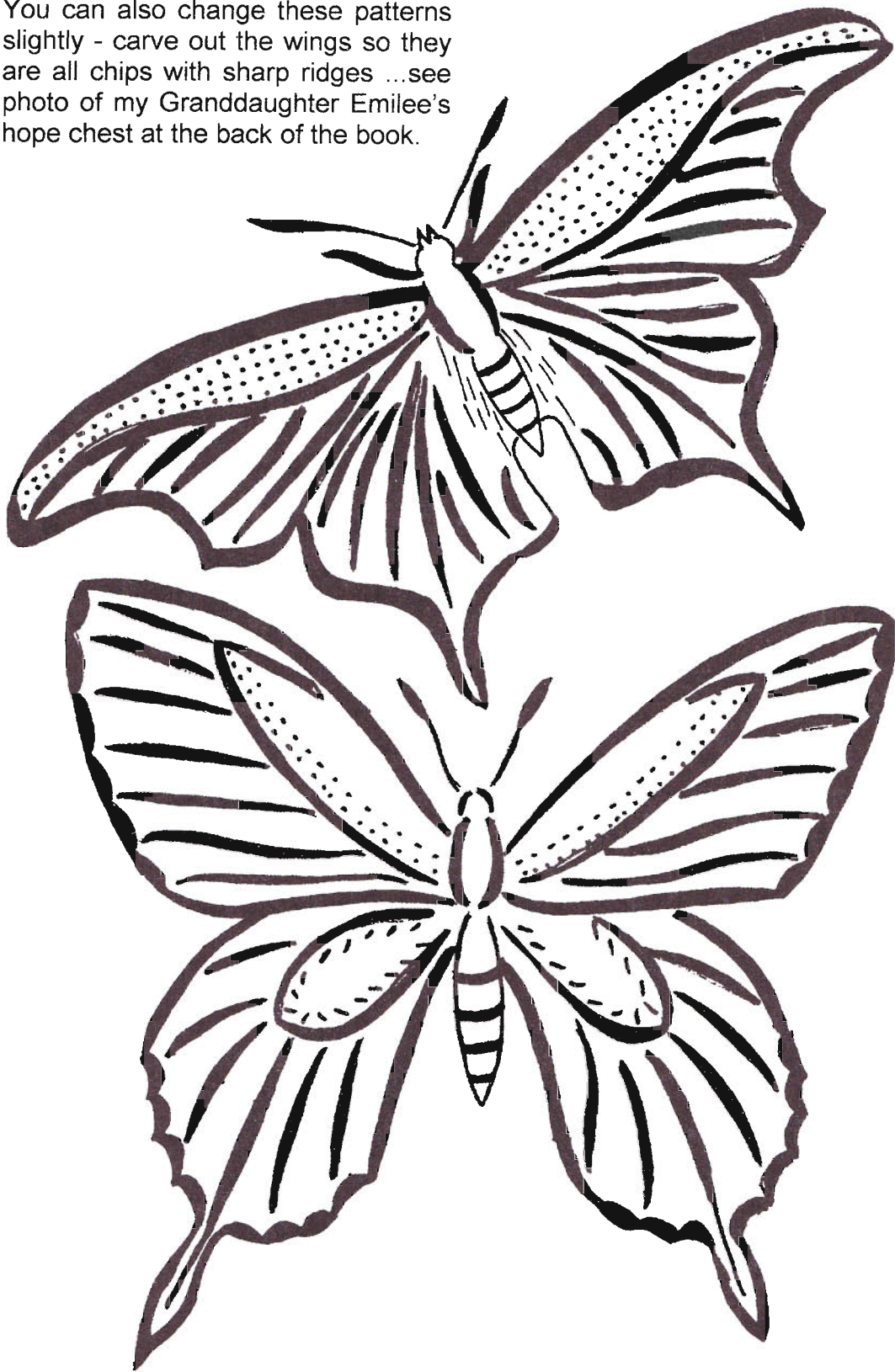
Pansies: I ain't touching that one either!

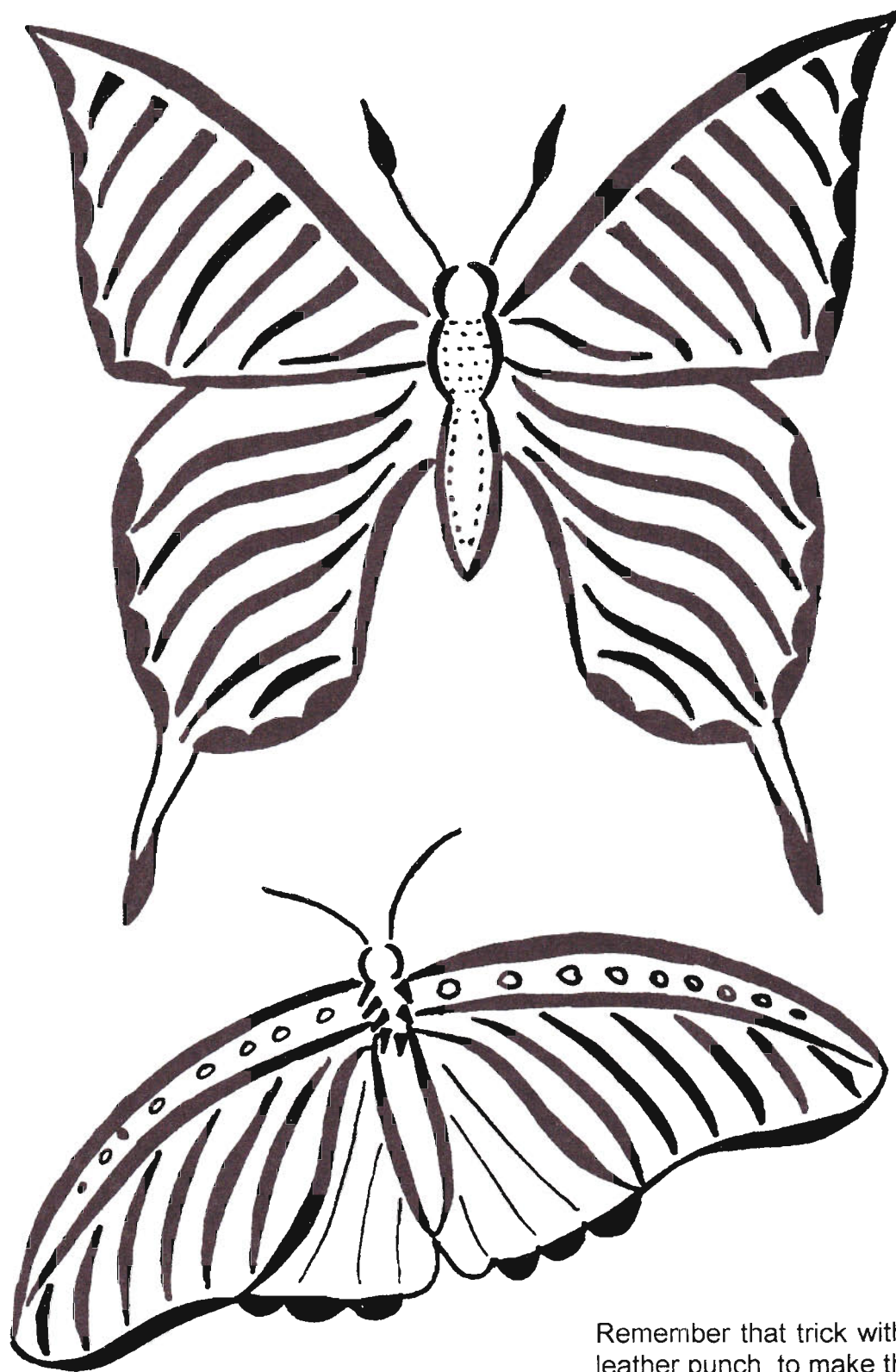




Feeling adventurous? Try any of these flutterbys by staining or painting your wood (excellent on basswood) first ...then chip carve the design! That way, the background is colored and the chips come out white ...very effective!

You can also change these patterns slightly - carve out the wings so they are all chips with sharp ridges ...see photo of my Granddaughter Emilee's hope chest at the back of the book.





Remember that trick with the
leather punch to make those
tiny rings!



Miss Mew is my neighbor's cat! I'm not crazy about cats! But my neighbors are pretty much okay, so here is the design.



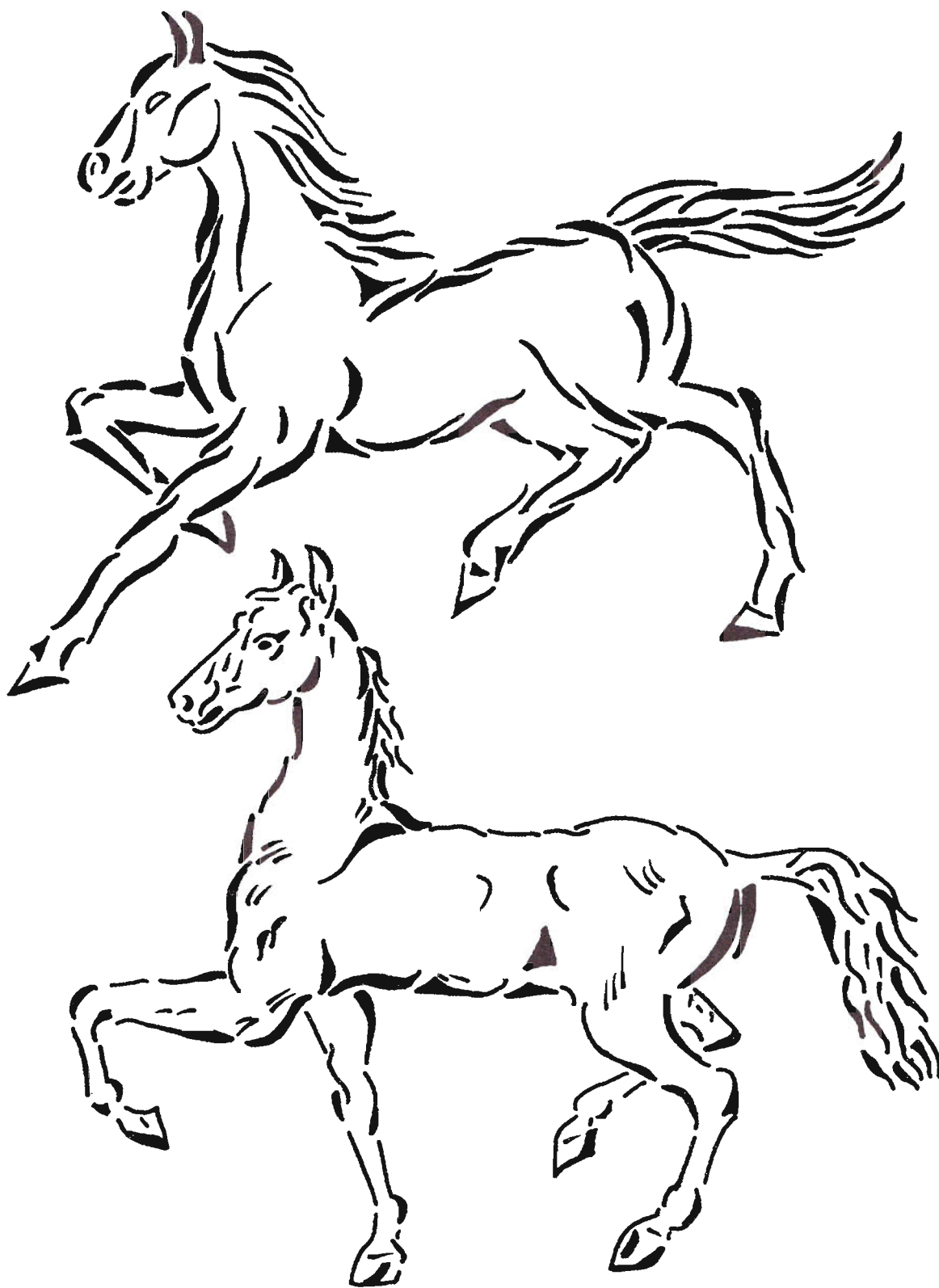
These here are three dawgs. I wasn't sure how you spelled them ...'dogs' maybe. But my son say it is 'dawgs'. He's got one so he should know! His dawg looks a little bit like all three of these.



Notice the stabs! Put them in as is, change them around a bit, or heck, just leave them outit's up to you! One of the **beauty things** (that is Great White North lingo) about free form is that is so quick to do. You can whip up a design on an old practice board and change it a bit without taking al lot of time.

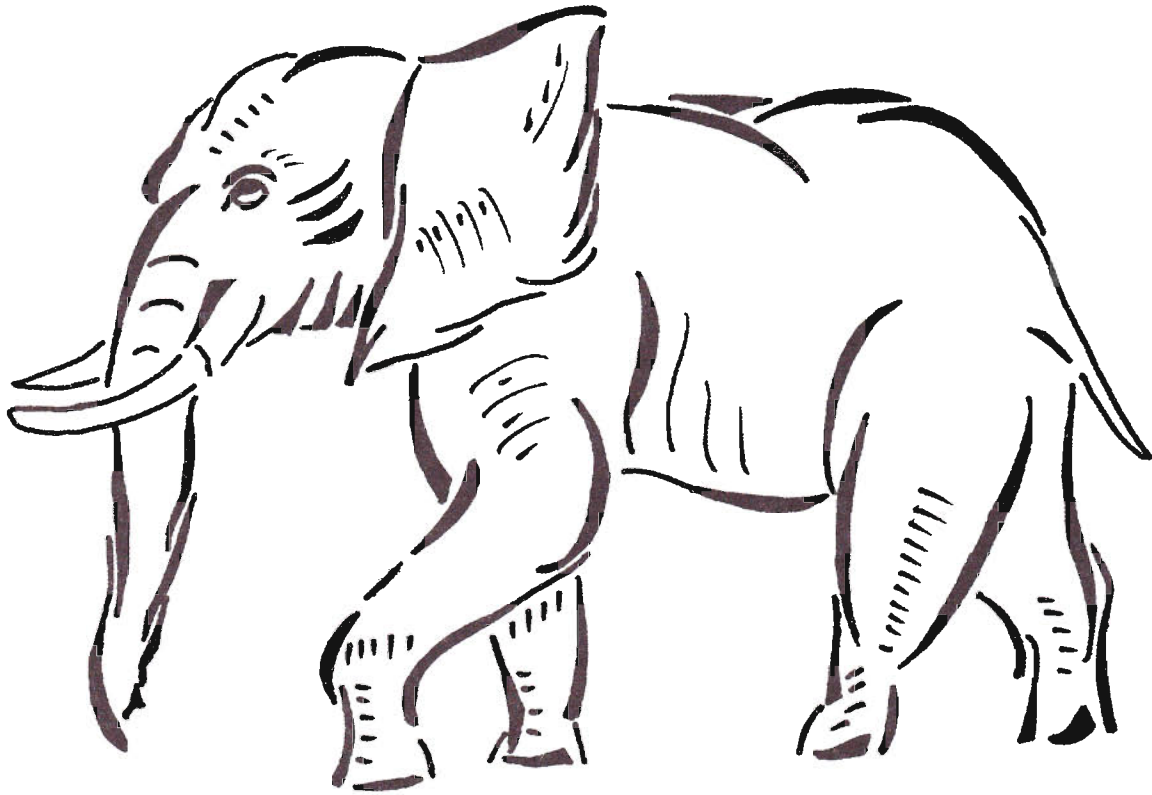


This guy looks fantastic when carved in butternut and then stained!

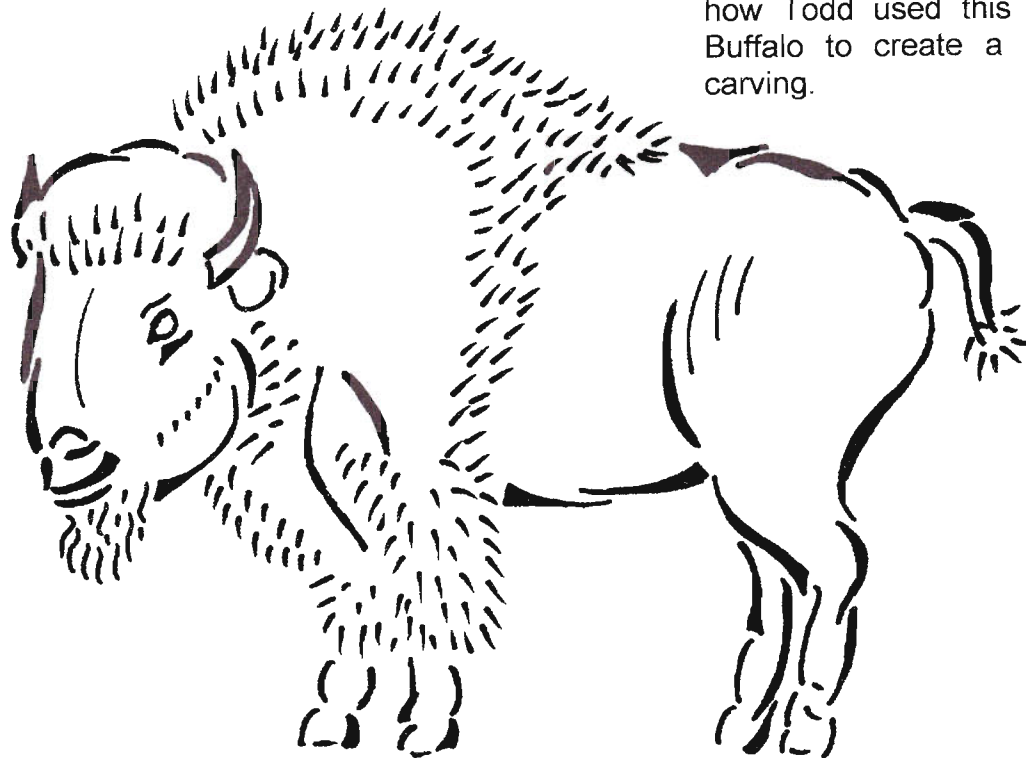

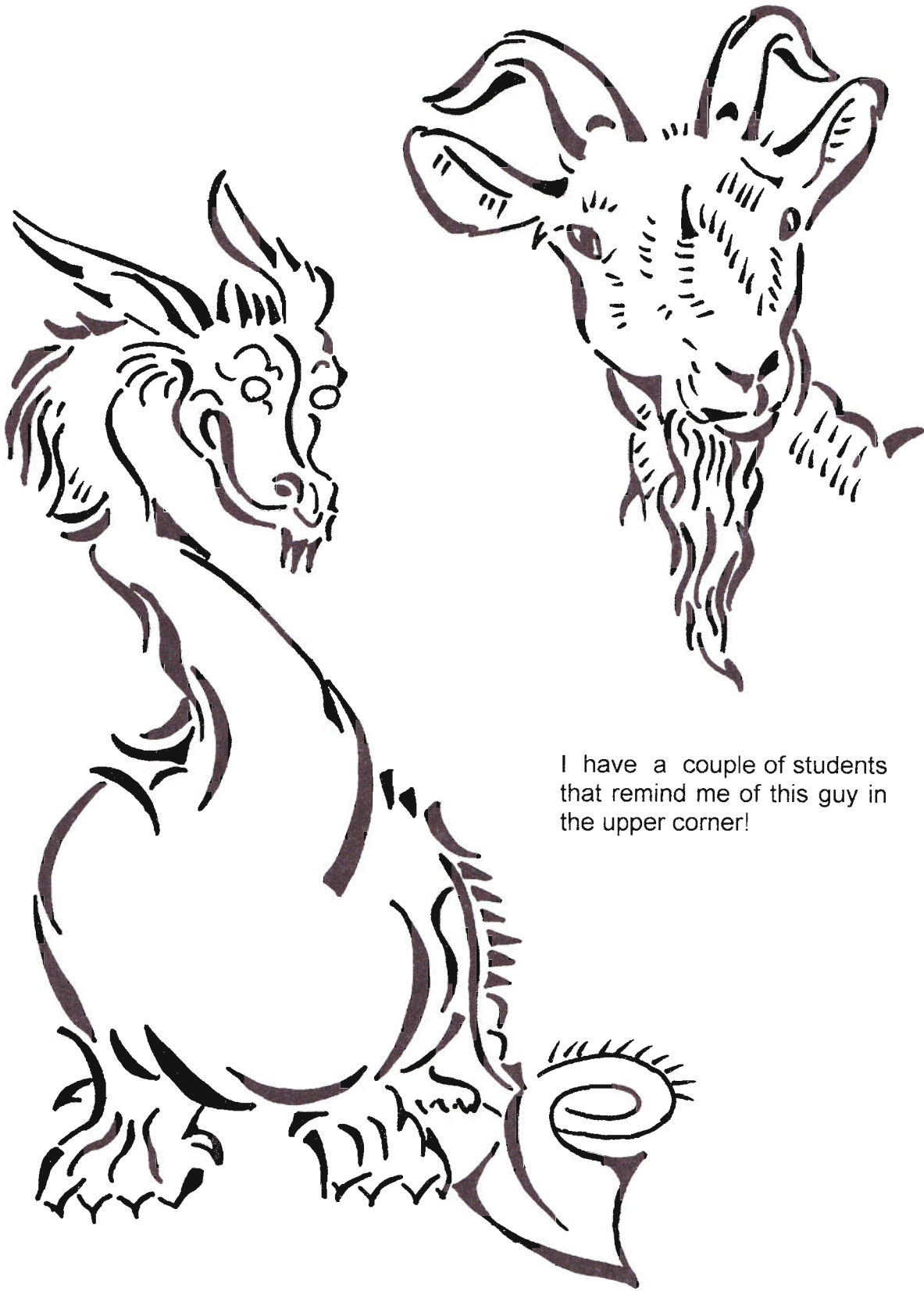

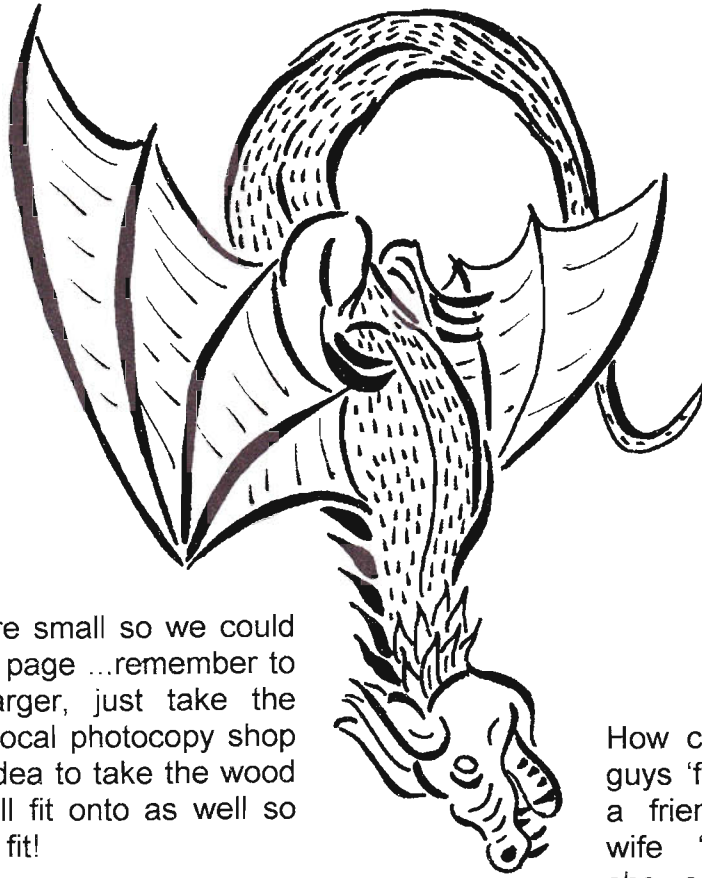


We were quite surprised to find that a number of people wanted patterns of mythical creatures ... we hope you enjoy our version of a few of them!

with a Unicorn!





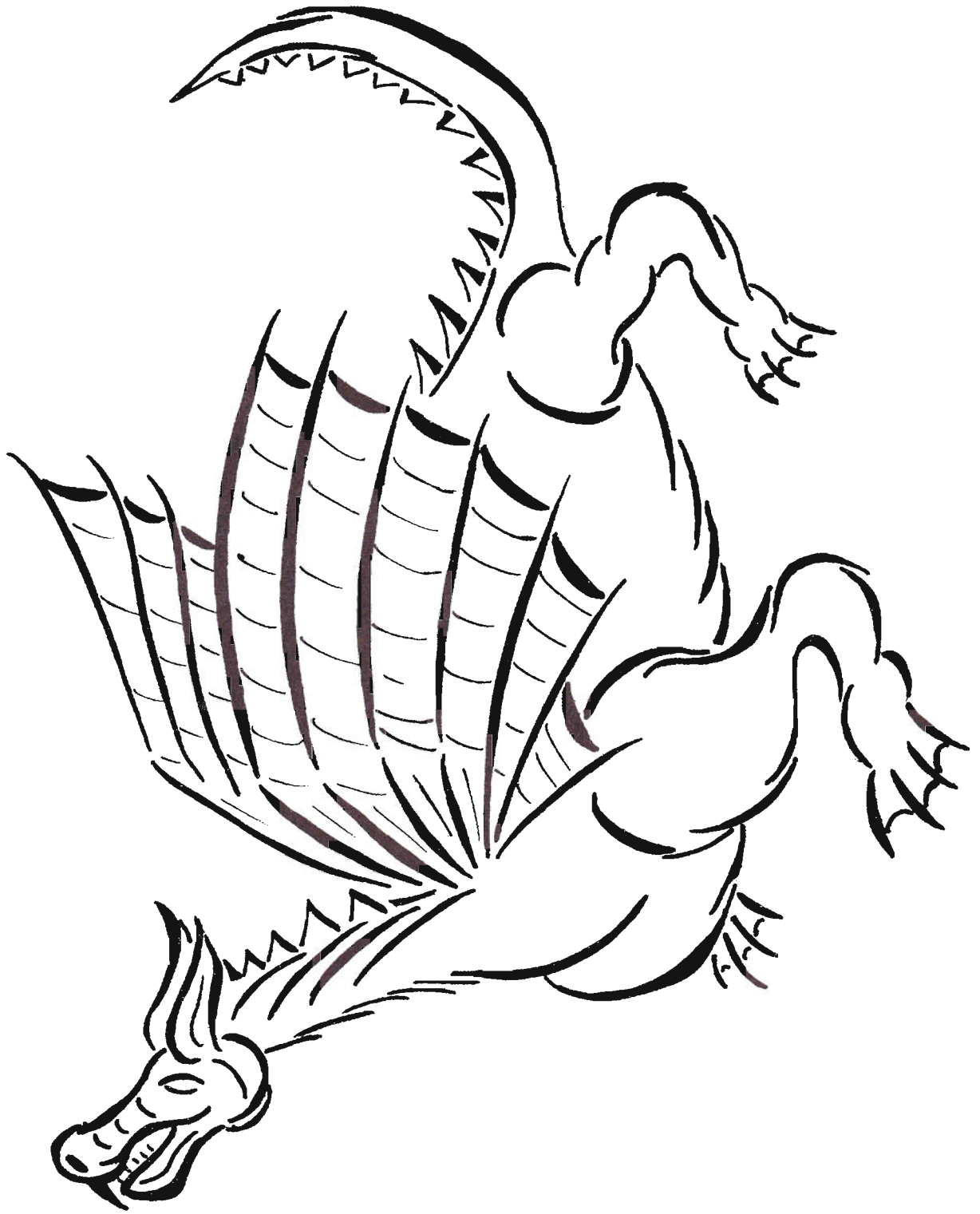

How come we call these guys 'fellas'? I remember a friend who called his wife 'dragon'seems she could leave 'scorch marks' on the wall when giving him whatfor!

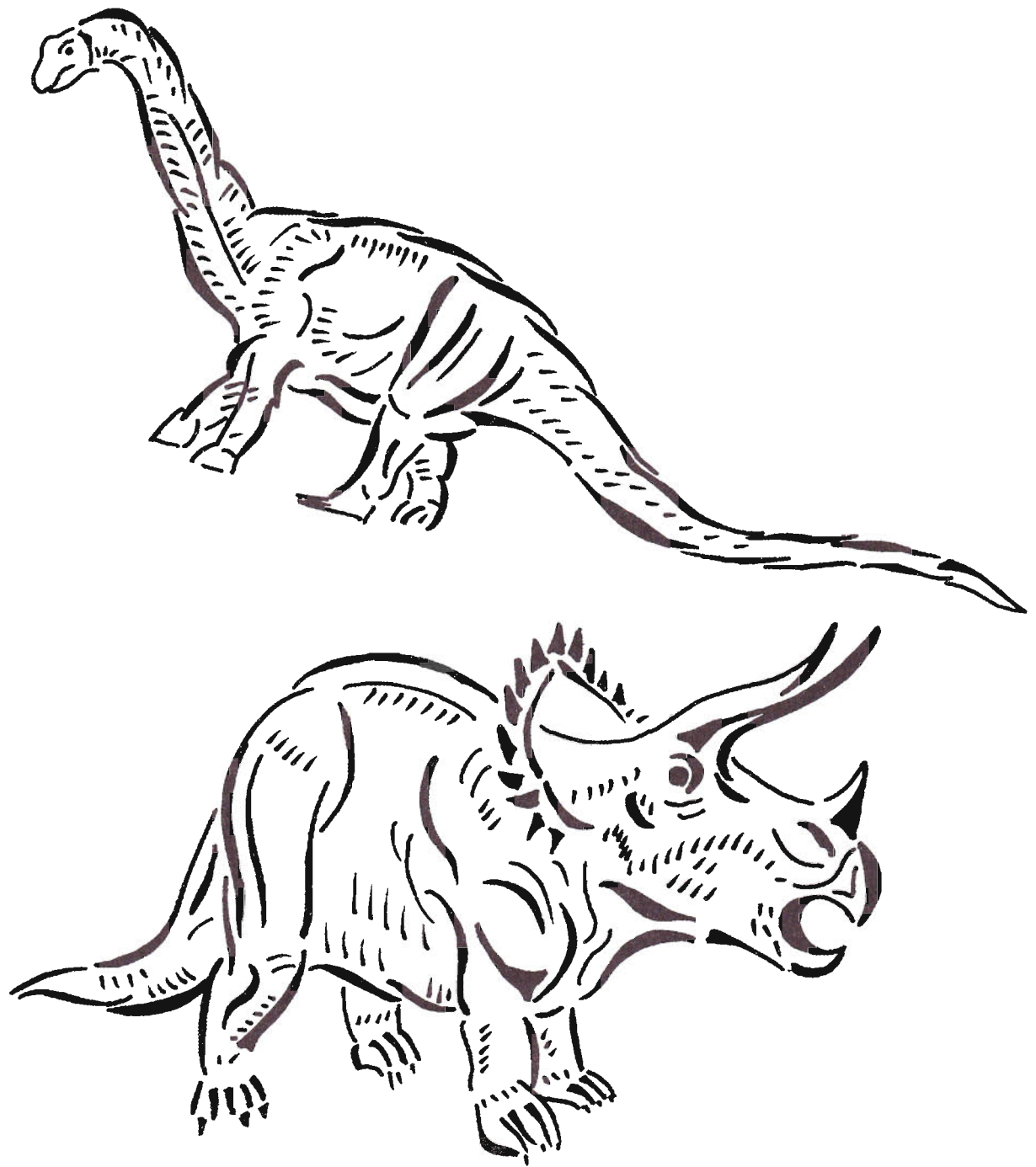




Pegasus: a winged horse that sprang from the blood of Medusa in Greek mythology.

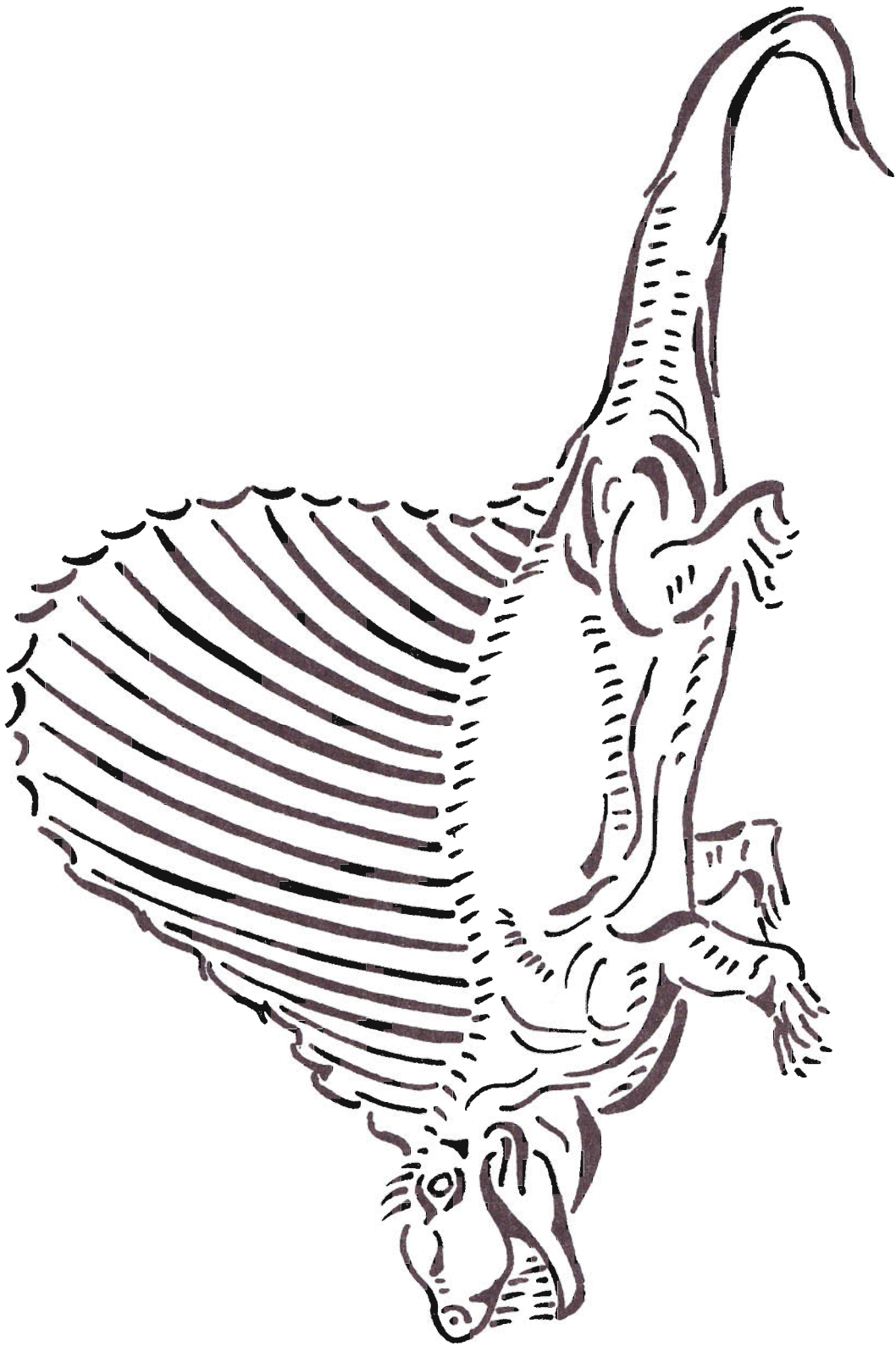

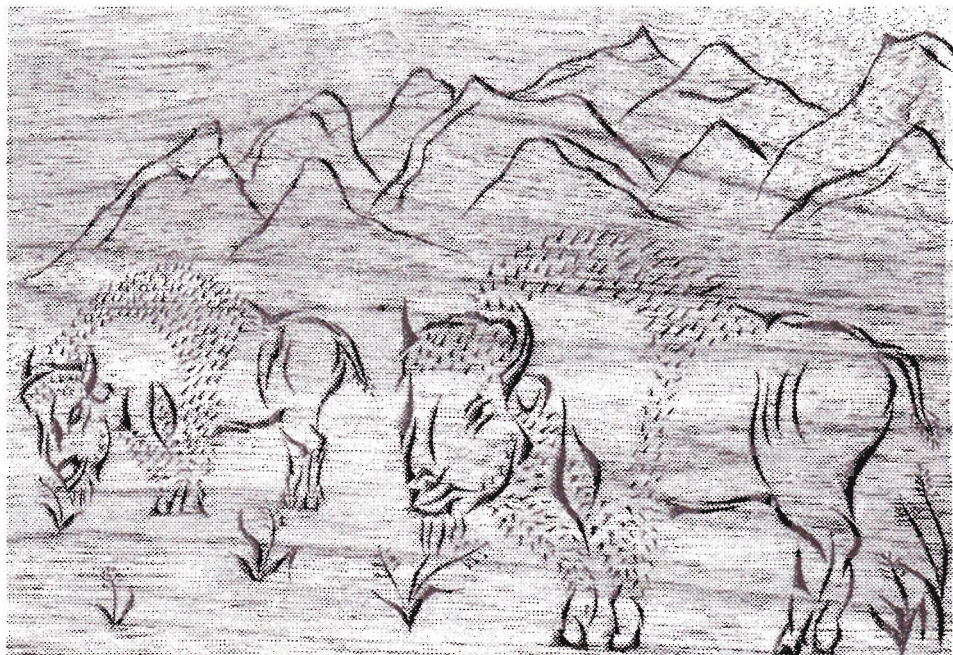
The ship and dog are carved on basswood plaques and the dolphins on butternut. See the waves under the ship and dolphinsit is necessary to 'anchor' subjects so that they do not appear to be 'floating' ...gives a point of reference, so to speak. The waves under the dolphins were carried into the border layout. Borders do not need to be geometricnotice how leaves, in both a positive and negative format, are used to frame in the dog.







These carvings were all done on butternut ~ the upper two on plaques and the buffalo on one of our small jewelry boxes. I do not know how many of the buffalo boxes Todd carved, they sold very well at the shows we attended. Notice how the flower was added to give the butterfly plaque some 'life'(and anchor it)as were the mountains and grass in the buffalo scene.

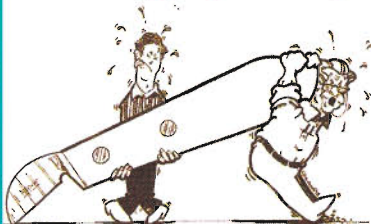
