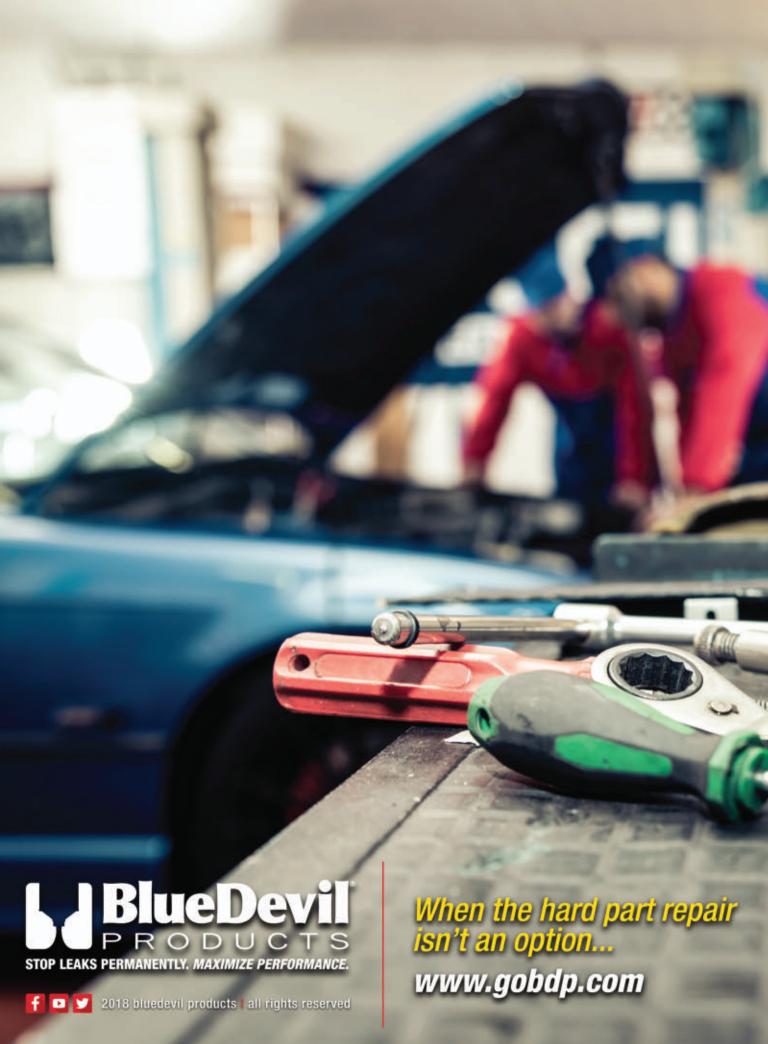





From The Editor-In-Chief

ur first issue of 2018 marks *Extreme How-To's* fifteenth year in business. It's been quite a run. I find it amazing how the clock seems to tick faster the older we get. And just like Bob Dylan sang, "The times, they are a changin'."

Think of all the technological advancements we've seen over the course of that decade and a half. Whereas I grew up with corded phones and even rotary dials, now it seems everyone carries a computer in their pocket that also functions as a phone, a video camera and a mini TV. Bluetooth technology means we can use those same phones to control all sorts of wireless appliances inside and outside the home.

And speaking of homes, consider all the major strides in tool technology that have impacted the way we build and remodel houses. You might still own a power tool that uses NiCad batteries, but that old battery technology has largely been supplanted in newer tools by lithium-ion batteries. The lithium-ion batteries weigh less and last longer than the NiCads, they're rechargeable in as little as 30 minutes, and deliver full power right up until they need to be recharged.

A task as basic as driving a screw has become easier in recent years with the advent of impact drivers. Unlike conventional powered screwdrivers, an impact driver uses an internal anvil to deliver much higher rotational torque, driving fasteners very quickly, and with little hand pressure needed from the user—just enough to keep it in the slots of the screw-head. This grants greater control and helps prevent the bit from jerking out of the fastener.

Remember the primitive days before oscillating multi-tools? Pioneered by the Fein company, these popular tools are now manufactured by virtually every major toolmaker thanks to their unmatched versatility. With the right blade, these handheld jacks-of-all-trades can make plunge cuts or flush cuts, remove grout, scrape paint, or sand a surface smooth. Now that these gadgets are widely available and affordable, they've practically replaced several other hand and power tools.

And although the average handyman or DIY'er isn't apt to give up their torpedo level or tape measure, those applications have changed, too. When I'm tackling a big project, I now use a device to project laser lines—perfectly plumb or level—onto a wall to mark my layout, which saves lots of time I'd otherwise spend with a pencil and a bubble vial. Similar laser tools can be used to map out tile layout on a floor. And with a laser distance meter, I can place it against a wall and simply click a button to get an accurate measurement of the entire room.

In many ways, the future is now, and homeimprovement technology is only going to evolve further. We plan to be there with you as it does, reporting in Extreme How-To on all the cool things to come.

Does interior brick need to be sealed?

• We recommend sealing brick on the home's interior, because an unsealed brick wall is a porous surface that attracts dirt and is nearly impossible to clean. Liquids are easily absorbed into untreated brick, causing unsightly stains. The first step is to clean the surface. For new brick walls, wait 28 days after construction is finished so the mortar has time for the alkalinity to get back to near neutral. Any stains on the wall will be "locked" into the surface by the sealer, so make sure the wall looks the way you want before sealing. Clean off any dried mortar spatter with a copper brush. (Avoid using a steel brush when cleaning brick, as it will leave a dark, black stain on the surface). Try removing any stains using a mild detergent and flushing with as much water as possible.

After the brick is clean and dry, choose a 100-percent acrylic sealer. The sealer can darken the surface slightly and add some sheen or gloss, so first apply a little material in an obscure location to make sure it's the look you want. Acrylic sealers are great for walls, but avoid using them on floors due to the wear of foot traffic. For application, simply brush and roll on. For larger projects, a sprayer can be used. Use a roller with a minimum 3/4-in. nap up to as thick as a 1-1/4-in. nap, depending on the depth of the mortar joints. Coat the entire surface just like you would paint a wall and allow it to dry for a couple of hours. Apply a second coat in the same manner. The sealer will need to cure, or harden, for approximately 7 to 10 days. When curing is complete, you'll have a beautiful, stain-resistant surface that will be easy to clean.



How can I remove the haze that covers my car's headlights?

• The oxidization of the plastic housing on the headlight can create a thick haze, which can worsen to • the point that it affects the light output. Kits are available at many automotive stores, which include the tools and materials you will need, and the kit costs about \$20. Another approach is to try cleaning off the haze with some aluminum paste and a buffing disc in a drill. Operate the buffer much like polishing your car, but don't stop moving the buffer and don't run it for more than 30 seconds in one spot or you risk overheating and melting the plastic on the headlights.

Can I use a power washer to clean vinyl siding?

• Yes, although you should be careful when using it. When cleaning, hold the power washer straight • at eye level to keep the water on top of the siding where it can clean most effectively. Do not aim the power washer upward because water may be driven behind the siding. Avoid using a pressure washer around any opening in the wall, such as windows, doors, electrical wiring and plumbing. You should also follow the siding manufacturer's recommendations. Some manufacturers don't want pressure washers used on their products at all. Others allow them, but have limitations on the amount of pressure and the cleaners that can be used. **EHT**

ircular saws are the go-to tools for making fast, accurate cuts in lumber, plywood, metal and more. Whether configured as a grab-and-go handheld, an angle-cutting miter saw, or a rip-ready table saw, these jobsite workhorses have been relied on for years for construction inside and outside the home.

These days, tool designers are tasked with making a good tool even better, and this article highlights some of the latest innovations in circ saws to hit the market.

TWO FROM EVOLUTION POWER TOOLS

Evolution Power Tools, well known for its high-performance metal-cutting circular saws, recently

let the *EHT* staff test a couple of their newest units with broader appliations. This time we looked at the Evolution Disc Cutter as well as the Rage3 10-in. Multipurpose Sliding Miter Saw, and liked what

When you need to cut concrete, stone or brick, the new 12-in. Electric Disc Cutter is an ideal alternative to high-maintenance gas-power cutters. The saw comes equipped with a 12-in. diamond blade for all sorts of masonry and concrete work—and it will even cut reinforced concrete. The large-diameter blade enables a 4-in. depth of cut (although this should be performed with progressive cutting passes, rather than burying the blade all at once).

We had a stack of landscape pavers and a few clay bricks. all of which the Disc Cutter ate right through like they were tasty snacks. The saw is sturdily constructed for professional use with robust housing, ergonomic grip positions, and a 15-amp hightorque electric motor. Plus, since the Disc Cutter produces no emissions, it can be used inside enclosed areas. This saw has shot up the ranks as the EHT team's new go-to tool for building patios, sidewalks, retaining walls and more.

Next up is the RAGE3 10-in. TCT Multipurpose Sliding Miter Saw. This one saw cuts steel, aluminum and wood using the same blade. The saw is built with a high-torque

The plunge action works smoothly, and the gliding action of the saw slices right along the cutline with pinpoint accuracy. 

Create a Green Roof

f you take pleasure in improving your house with fun DIY projects, why not install green roof? Not only can a living roof be aesthetically pleasing, but they help protect from storm waters, provide your home with sound and heat insulation, possibly prolong the life of your roof, provide a habitat for wildlife and reduce carbon emission.

There are two types of green roofs: the intensive green roof, which requires a lot of maintenance; and the extension, which requires less maintenance.

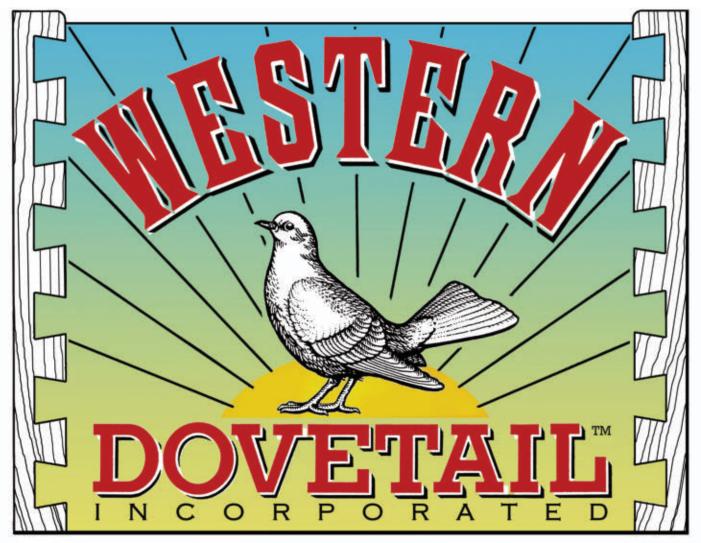
The most typical small-scale DIY green roofs are found on sheds, vegetation on a porch roof, or the roof of a garage. If you want to reap the benefits of larger vegetation, then you can do so if the roof of your house is flat or slightly sloped. When the slope of your roof is very steep, you would need to get a professional to assist you.

GREEN ROOF BASICS

The roof you are planting on should be structurally sound and

strong enough, without wet areas, rotting wood or damaged materials. Waterproofing the roof is the first step, and this can be done by adding a membrane layer. Micron damp-proof liner or pond liner should cover the entire area where you wish to plant to avoid water



seeping past. The only area that should be kept open and bordered to ensure no plants grow over it is the edge of the roof where the water runs down the gutter.



STEP 1

The next layer is a weed suppressing membrane which keeps the roots of the plants from growing through the first layer of your roof.



STEP 2

On a small-scale green roof, you can use old blankets as the next layer which will retain moisture, but for the roof of your home, you should opt for Geotextile membrane, which will resist fungi and bacteria.

STEP 3

An inch layer of gravel or limestone chips should come next to ensure proper drainage. A wellgraded blend of particles with




sizes ranging from 1/8 to 1/2 inch is preferred.



STEP 4

On top of gravel layer, you can add a layer of separation fabric or





add the soil directly. Many DIY green roofs are between 3 and 8 inches (70-200 mm) deep. Some stores even provide special "green roof" soil, but you can make the

mixture yourself with a ratio of 70-80 percent inorganic material and 20-30 percent of organic material. A good soil mixture should be firm and not fluffy.





STEP 5

Let the planting begin! Your local plant supplier can find green roof seeds, but if you do not want to wait for the seeds to grow, you can purchase prevegetated mats or do your planting with plants you prefer from cuttings or plug plants.

FLAT VS. SLOPING ROOFS?

The easiest green roof installations are on flat roofs or those with a small small slope consisting of no more than a 3-ft. rise for every 12 ft. of length. By keeping it under this, you do not even need stabilization. When you are installing a green roof on a steeper slope, you need to reinforce a system of a tray planting or create a terrace system for the soil to keep intact.

Watering your green roof during the hot season every once in a while is most of the caring that's required. Bear in mind that extension green roofs do not need much maintenance as far as trimming goes. For whatever reason you have decided to make your green roof, just remember to have fun along the way. **EHT**



ur clothing style is not the only thing affected by trends. 

COOL ROOFS

The idea of a cool roof came up while researching the reflective properties of specific materials and colors. We all know the "white and black T-shirt rule;" wear white when it sweltering hot and avoid dark colors, right? Well, manufacturers applied the same law on roofing systems and revealed a new market of cool roofs. Cool roofing systems reflect sunlight and therefore do not absorb heat, thanks to the light color and reflective paint, white glue and unique gravel mixture. The reflective surface will reduce the power consumption of your household due to less AC usage.

GREEN OR LIVING ROOFS

A few decades ago, claiming that you possess a living roof would've been serious evidence of your

SELECTING A METAL ROOF

Today's residential metal roofing comes in a wide variety of styles and designs, from standing seam to shake, slate or tile. Some of today's metal roofs are coated with a granular texture to look like traditional asphalt shingles. The panels of metal roofs interlock with each other, providing stiff resistance to high winds.

Metal roofing can be made of galvanized steel, galvalume steel, stainless steel, aluminum, copper or zinc alloy. The sturdiest option, steel roof systems have a metallic coating of zinc, or a combination of zinc and aluminum, that is bonded to the steel at the factory to prevent rust from forming. This is followed by a coating of epoxy

primer and a baked-on acrylic topcoat that adds color and protection. Aluminum products are extremely lightweight and commonly used in residential roofing. Aluminum won't rust, but must still be coated for a finished appearance. The coatings are similar to those used on steel roofing. Copper and Zinc Alloys are both known for their lowmaintenance durability, but they can also be very expensive options.

Ask about the roof system's flashings and accessories, and how the valleys are installed. If your area is prone to freezing temperatures, it might be smart to choose an "open" valley system that carries water on top of the roof rather than a "closed" valley, which carries water

through channels beneath the panels. The hidden channels have been known to clog with ice and snow, causing accumulated water to infiltrate the roof system.

Light-colored metal roofing can help to reflect heat, which can lower energy bills. With steel, copper and zinc roofs, this works best when the metal is painted with a bright color or light metallic coating. Aluminum, however, inherently reflects radiant heat, even when painted in darker colors.

Choose a roof system in which all fasteners and roof components are made of a compatible metal. Specify a system with concealed

fasteners. Any exposed fasteners or holes through the panels are areas where water can potentially enter the roof system. Many metal roofing systems use "clips" to fasten the panels rather than fasteners that attach the panels directly to the roof. The clips allow for expansion and contraction of the metal—very important to standing seam systems with long panels.

Metal roofing, especially steel, requires a good coating for long-term durability. Product warranty lengths are usually determined by a combination of the metal and the coating. Look for a finish that has proven the test of time. And make sure the finish is warranted against fading, chalking, chipping and detaching from the base metal.

n Instagram the word (or words) shiplap has been hash-tagged 162,503-times, meaning shiplap is popular and is here to stay. I've made shiplap installation videos for both for HomeDepot.com and MyFixitUpLife's YouTube channel (please subscribe). Like any fad that sticks, it's not just because someone popular likes it (such as Joanna Gaines from HGTV's "Fixer Upper.") It sticks because it works. It's awesome.

I installed a feature wall in my living room and now I'm installing a different wall in my basement. I'll touch on both projects in this article. The shiplap I installed on both jobs is called Arauco TruChoice, and you can get it at Home Depot.

The first thing to sort out with shiplap is how you want it oriented on the wall. Unlike what may be its most antithetical wall cladding—dry-wall—shiplap boards can be installed just about any way you want them to achieve different

looks and textures. Mainly, it's installed horizontally, vertically, diagonally, or in a V-joint. However, because it's a wood product, the sky is the limit with how you can design patterns.

NAIL THE LAYOUT BEFORE NAILING THE BOARDS

Unless you're framing new walls (like in a basement reno), it'll be easiest to install shiplap horizontally because there are wall studs to nail into.


I have seen at least one video on installing a different, plankish wall-cladding product that left out so many aspects of real-world installation that its hard-sell of "this is soooooo easy" was almost criminal. So, don't get beguiled by beauty and a camera on Youtube. Shiplap is easy to install—if you know how to make it easy.

The first big decision you have to make: Topdown? Or bottom-up? And the main questions to wrap your head around are:

- **1.** How will the transition between the existing base molding and the shiplap work?
- 2. Can part of the existing base molding be removed? For example, does it have a "base cap" or is it a single piece? How does this affect how you'll install it?
- **3.** Is there crown molding to deal with?
- **4.** Is your starting point parallel (or reasonably close to parallel) with the end point? (Ours wasn't by about 1-inch, but we made it work.)
- **5.** With near mathematical certainty, a board will need to be ripped to width on the table saw. Where do you want that rip located?

After answering these questions, I decided that installing the shiplap from the top down was best.

HORIZONTAL - HOW-TO

When you take all the stuff off the wall, have a place for the device covers and screws. Have a clean table or level surface to place your TV (if needed) that's safe from jobsite goings-on. Have a security team on high-alert for when you move the Rembrandt. Think it through.

Take all the stuff off the wall like TVs, sconces, switch plates, etc.

After removing the switch plate, you'll need to bring the device out to match the new wall surface. You may need to screw a box extender ring onto the existing switch box.

Next, take the measurements of the wall, floor and ceiling. Are the top and bottom borders of the horizontal shiplap wall parallel? This is important info.



Measure to see if the top and bottom borders of the shiplap wall are parallel.

This will most likely show up in the Old House Shuffle, where the floor and ceiling aren't in the same physical universe as parallel. The house shown, in fact, was built before the invention of the straight line, and required constant workarounds to make the new stuff blend with the old.

Here I had to make a choice: Level or parallel. I'll get into how this worked out later. In the photo, my hair is falling out in clumps as I try to figure out how I'm going to compensate for the inch or so the layout is out of whack.



Mark the stud locations. One good way to find them is to look for tell-tales like proud spots or nail pops where drywall fasteners are.

Mark the stud locations. Just because they should be located on 16-in. centers doesn't mean they are. I try and find telltales to at least get me started. There's almost always a nail pop somewhere, which I can then locate and pull my tape from after that. A stud finder is also a handy tool to use.



A cut like this should be easy. It isn't. I use scraps to get it right.

Use a scrap piece of shiplap to mark (in real life, not with a

tape measure) how a wall penetration like a device box intersects with a board. Transfer the marks to your actual shiplap workpiece.

Transfer the marks from the scrap to the actual piece.

Tape measures require interpretation. Pattern pieces require copying.



Copying is easier. Learning this instantaneously made me a better carpenter while simultaneously reducing my frustration level about a million percent.



The jigsaw is your friend here. And this little 12-volt is a nice one.

To be extra accurate on oddball cuts like notches, I sometimes use a miter or table saw to make the intersecting cuts. For this job, since it'll be covered by a switch plate, going full-tilt jigsaw was fine.



Top-down installation is easy and fast.

I snagged this concept from tiling: Sliver cuts—they are to be

avoided like the plague in anything we do. They show that you're not at the top of your game. Are they sometimes unavoidable? Sure. Are they harder to see when they're behind a couch or table? Uh-huh.

For this reason, mainly, I chose a top-down installation approach here. To make this work, nail the top of the upper board, then slot in the lower board. Use a tap block to protect the board when hammering.

Then, nail the bottom of the upper board. Nail the top of the lower board. Rinse. Repeat.



This is what a nail looks like that hits a drywall screw. No problem. Grab your "dikes" (diagonal cutters), nip the nail and move on.




Here's an example of a base cap, which is removable.

The world might throw you a bone, and your base molding might have a base cap that's removable. And your base molding might be parallel to your ceiling. (I have lived in old houses for so long, I'm not even sure I'd know what to do if that happened.)

The last piece...loving it!

On this project, we left the base cap on. That's because the floor and ceiling were soooo out of parallel to each other. The way





I disguised the problem was to table-saw a larger lap on the bottom of the last board, so it would lay over the tapered base cap. It was an elegant solution to an inelegant wall situation. Lesson: There's a way to make it look like it grew there. You'll figure it out. And don't settle for less than your best.

Rip the transition strip.

Nobody is paying me to say this, but after having installed a bunch of shiplap I've discovered its versatility is a one-stop-shop of sorts. One example is the transition strips for covering the end cuts where the feature wall meets the drywall. There's no need to manufacture something or to buy another type of material. Simply rip the lap off the ship, and you've got your transition strip. And in a basement reno, I've used shiplap as the base molding, and everything ties in together. I've made hatches and doors, and I could easily trim a deep window with it.



Nail end-strips with a brad nailer.

And, there's no need for big nails on small pieces. Once the end caps are ripped from a full piece of TruChoice. I pop them on with a brad nailer.



For the painting phase, not all putty knives were created anywhere near as equal as this one.

After the last piece of carpentry, we become painters. Fill the fastener holes first. Make your life better and use a wicked awesome putty knife. And, maybe bypass the putty. I've had better luck and flatter fills with joint compound.



Caulk the seams.

Nothing tightens up some nice carpentry like a sweet bead of caulk. And for a professional looking caulk finish, use a bucket of water and a grout sponge. If you're wiping down caulk with a dry finger and a roll of paper towels, go back to the drawing board. As The Steve Miller Band said:

Everything's better when wet. Unless it's your attic, and it's raining. Then, not so much.



Clean out the filler before painting.

Four things to remember...
First, TruChoice comes in 8-ft.
lengths at The Depot, so on walls
longer than 8 feet you'll need to
"break" them on a stud. In other



words, on a 12-ft. long wall you'll need an 8-footer and a 4-footer. But don't cut them 8 and 4. Cut them to transition so you can nail both ends to the same stud.

Second, the pattern should be random. Use two pieces on some courses. Three on another. Start with a long board, then start with a short one. If you don't do this, it'll look laddered and weird. Don't make short pieces too short.

Anything under 2-feet-ish might look cobbled together.

Third, whatever you use for filler will get in the seam. Because wood is a natural product it can move with temperature and humidity changes. For this reason, I don't like to use a rigid filler in a potentially flexible application.

Fourth, there is no better tool to clean out the filler than my

Hyde multi-tool. More, it may be my most versatile tool, and I share that with you because NOT having one is costing you time and aggravation. I use mine on nearly every job: Shim, gouge, lever, spacer and, yes, even to open paint cans. It lives either in my hand or in my tool pouch.



Brush on the paint finish.



SHIPLAP SOLUTIONS

It took me a few minutes to realize that a brush-applied coating got the best results fastest. A roller will almost certainly leave drips. I found it was fastest to slow down and brush the coating on. It really didn't take all that long and it kind of got hypnotic. TruChoice is double-primed at the factory, which is nice, but to make the color and gloss truly even, two paint coats work best.

VERTICAL & DIAGONAL— NAIL IT RIGHT

For anything other than horizontal installations there needs to be what I call a "universal nailing surface." In other words, you need to be able to nail everywhere on the wall, not just the studs.



For non-horizontal installs, use a continuous backer like 1/2-inch OSB. Mark the stud locations for accurate fastening.

If you've got an open wall frame (as in, you're building a new wall in a basement reno) adding horizontal blocking between studs will do the job for a vertical install. I wouldn't go much more than 24-inches between blocks.

For diagonal or vertical where you don't have access to the framing, you have to go a little more Mac Daddy. Good news, the solution is easy. Simply sheet the wall with 1/2-in. plywood or OSB. I suppose 3/8-in. would work too if you're really sweating that extra 1/8-in., but I'd rather you stick to 1/2-in. for a good connection over time.



INSTALLING A V-PATTERN

To install a V-pattern, I use a header strip centered in the wall space. I think it looks good. And I know it is easier than lining up miters perfectly. Plumb is your friend here, moreso than even or parallel. Be extra careful to get this right and the rest of the job will go much easier.



A vertical piece—plumb and centered in the space—is a nice look for a V-Pattern.



A V-joint is awesome for small and large rooms. Make sure you're level and even, and you're off to the races.

Next step for a V-joint is to make sure the miters close at the bottom. Even more important: Make sure the tips of each wing are dead level with each other. Miss this early step and you'll wonder, Why doesn't it happen like this on TV?!

Because even though TV and Joanna are driving the upsurge in shiplap's popularity, you have to install it in a real house and really look at it. The show goes on, whether you want it to or not, so it might as well be the best one you can produce.

Executive Producer: You. EHT

NEED TO PRY UP A PIECE OF SHIPLAP? USE A SCRAP.

This is a lesson in surface area, which is pretty much an esoteric concept no one cares about. However, you need to know that prying with a wide surface is easier on the wood than prying with a small surface. In this case, the wall was lumpy and I needed to jack the top



piece out a little. Rather than stick a skinny pry bar in there, I used a scrap piece. It's easier on the wood and waaaaaay less likely to break off the lap or sink into the drywall if the nails fight you too much.



Repair A Sagging Headliner

A tiny investment in time and money makes a big improvement inside your truck's cab.

e seldom look at the roof above our heads when we get in a vehicle. That is unless the headliner material is starting to hang like baggy pants. Then you can't take your eyes off it. That's how the interior roof of my Ford Bronco was looking.

After more than two decades of being baked by the sun, heat had deteriorated the glue holding the thin cloth to the formed foamboard that served as a heat shield between the metal roof and the interior. With nothing to hold the cloth tight, it had begun to sag in

a multitude of places, including right above my head where it was becoming a major annoyance. It looked real ugly.

Sagging headliners are a very common malady of older vehicles, especially those left sitting out in the elements. When it comes to pickups and SUVs like my Bronco, the fix is very easy: It takes about two hours, doesn't require a degree in auto mechanics, and the cost of materials, picked up at any automotive upholstery supply shop, is less than \$30.

Here's how to do it.



Automotive headliners will sag after time, especially in vehicles left sitting out in the elements, exposed to the relentless heat of the sun, which can reach more than 175-degrees, deteriorating the glue holding the cloth material. The fix is removing the old headliner and replacing the sagging material with new material that can be purchased at any auto upholstery shop or supplier.



First step is removing the trim that holds the headliner in place. A Phillips screwdriver is all that's needed. Be sure to keep the screws with the trim piece they came out of, because they could be different lengths.



The domelight must be removed as well. Pay close attention to how the light came out. In some vehicles the screws that hold the light in place also attach the wires that provide its power and ground.

The last items to remove are the screws that hold the sunvisors in place. Slowly remove both the swivel end and the lock end so you can see how they fit back into place. The latter has a locating pin on the back, and the swivel has a



notch to help position it during reinstallation so the screw holes line up.



To remove the headliner, carefully slide it toward the windshield and down. It's made from formed foamboard, so be very careful in handling. Most likely the corners where the sunvisor swivels attach will be cracked or broken. The ones in our truck were almost in two pieces. We'll show you how to fix them later.



Lay the headliner on a flat work surface, then carefully remove the old material. In some vehicles the headliner and its thin foam backing will easily peel away from the headliner itself. If that's the case, use a stiff brush to remove all the old foam. The foam stayed put on our truck's headliner while the cloth came off easily, so we left the old foam in place as added insulation.



The only materials you need to recover the headliner are headliner material (it's thin cloth with a thin foam backer) and a heavy-duty trim adhesive that's designed to withstand high heat. We bought the Sprayway Fast Tack 92 and a yard (36"x60") of headliner material to match our interior at a local automotive upholstery supply shop for \$30. Some vehicles may require less or more material.

Both visor corners of our truck's headliner were cracked. To repair them we used a little J-B Weld and duct tape to make them one with the headliner. Duct tape holds the two pieces together until the do-it-all epoxy sets up, and it's good

insurance we won't break them again during the re-install.

The next step is to lay the new headliner material over the clean headliner and use a couple small clamps near the middle along one edge to keep it from moving sideto-side. Then we folded back the cloth and sprayed the exposed half of both the headliner and the foam back of the cloth with the contact adhesive.





After the adhesive gets tacky (2-3 minutes), carefully spread the headliner cloth over the headliner, slowly working from the center out toward the corners so there are no wrinkles. Take your time and press down firmly to ensure the cloth adheres to the contours of your headliner.



Once the headliner material is smoothed in place, flip the headliner over and trim away the excess cloth. A great tool for this is a carpet layer's curved knife. A razor blade also does the job.



Be sure to trim any material covering the holes for the sunvisors' mounts and dome light.

The re-installation is simple:
Reverse the steps in taking it out.
This is best done with a helper,
because holding the headliner in
place while trying to install the
screws in the front and rear trim
pieces can be a bit tricky onehanded. The finished headliner
looks awesome, and it will help
keep the cab warmer in the winter,
cooler in the summer. All for just
a couple hours labor and thirty
bucks. **EHT**
