• Do certain colors of house paint resist fading longer than others?

• Dark colors are the most likely to fade noticeably, but even bright colors can change over time due to • the effects of UV radiation from the sun. Fading and bleaching happen very slowly. You might not even notice the color on your exterior walls has changed over the years until you try to repaint a chipped spot, and find the original color no longer matches. You can't completely eliminate the effects of the sun's rays on exterior paint, but paint technology is always changing, and many new paints have special sun-proof additives. Lessen the impact by choosing high-quality paints with UV inhibitors. Still, the UV radiation will eventually take its toll, and you'll still need to repaint periodically to maintain a quality finish.

My brother-in-law says our dishwasher should be installed with an "anti-syphon loop." What is he
 talking about?

• An anti-syphon loop is made in a dishwasher drain line to prevent any backflow of water between the kitchen sink and dishwasher (or vice-versa). A simple method to accomplish this is to make a big loop with the excess length of flexible drain hose. The hose should loop up just beneath the countertop and then back down to the garbage disposal or main sink drain to prevent back-siphoning. Another method is to run the drain hose from the dishwasher to an antisiphon valve, which you can find at your local plumbing supply store or home center.

• The blown-in insulation in my attic is compressed and I'd like to add more. What is the easiest way to do this myself?

• If you don't need to add much insulation, you can purchase bags of loose-fill fiberglass or cellulose and install by hand. If you do have a big job ahead of you, then blowing machines can usually be found at the same place you purchase the insulation. You may have to rent them (or at least post a security deposit), but in some cases you may be able to use the blower at no additional charge to what you pay for the insulating material.

Another option is to switch from the blown-in type of insulation to rolls or batts. Unrolling fiberglass insulation can be an easy and inexpensive method to increase insulation levels. When the joist cavity is full, install the new layer of unfaced insulation perpendicular to the first, covering the ceiling joists to reduce heat loss through the wood.

If you install additional fiberglass insulation over existing insulation, be sure to use unfaced rolls or batts. The facing acts as a vapor retarder that helps reduce the amount of moisture entering a wall, ceiling or floor. In hot climates, the original layer of insulation should already have a vapor retarder facing the living area of your home. If you add a second vapor retarder with another layer of faced insulation, any moisture that does get through the first layer may condense on the second. This can cause water stains on the ceiling and could lead to mold and structural damage. **EHT**

Maintenance Must-dos for Garage Doors

arage doors are opened and closed multiple times a day, yet few homeowners conduct regular checks and inspections on them. In fact, they are often the most neglected part of a house, even though they are frequently used and make up a large portion of a home's outward appearance.

Conducting repeated tests on a garage door and its opener can help you catch any problems before they become worse.

Moreover, inspections ensure that it is safe. Safety is a particularly important concern when you have kids and pets in the house.

How can you maintain your door so it lasts longer? Here are 10 tips:

CHECK THE HARDWARE

The easiest way to do a quick hardware check is to listen to the door when it opens and closes. It should move effortlessly and make minimum noise. Scraping noises, grinding sounds and jerky movements suggest there is an issue.

Furthermore, ensure that all loose hardware is tightened up. Use a socket wrench to fasten any loose bolts or roller brackets.



Any grinding or scraping noises coming from the hardware signals a problem that will only worsen over time if not addressed.

DO IT YOURSELF

REVIEW THE BALANCE

To review your door's balance, you'll need to first disconnect the opener to the door. Next, manually move the door halfway up or down. It should stay suspended

when you let it go. If it doesn't, the garage door isn't balanced. (See sidebar on adjusting doors with extension springs.)

If the garage door uses a torsion spring that is mounted

parallel along the top of the door, you should call a professional garage door repairman to correct a problem with the balance. The good news is that the design of the torsion spring holds its balance more reliably than extension springs.



To test the door's balance, determine at what point it will remain suspended when roughly halfway open. If that point is more than four-feet or less than three-feet above the floor, you will need to balance the door.

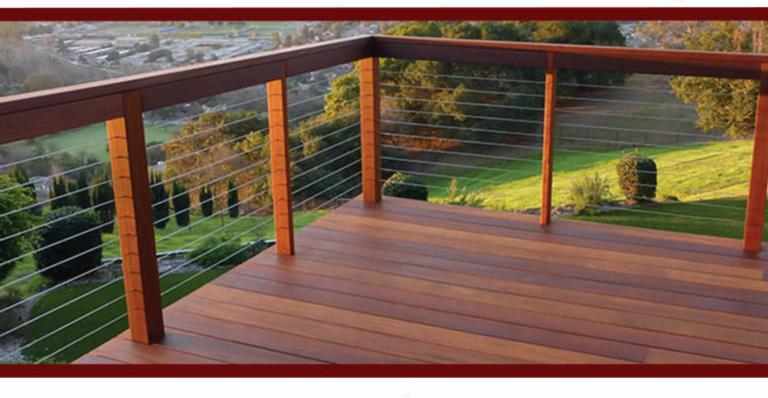


Torsion springs are under extreme tension, and installing them requires solid steel winding bars. If you need to adjust or replace a torsion spring, it's best to call a professional because lack of proper training or tools can lead to an uncontrolled release of spring forces, which can cause serious injury.

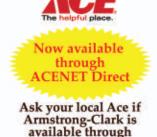

DON'T FORGET THE REMOTE BATTERIES

Garage doors are opened and closed innumerable times a year. Therefore, it's essential to replace the remote's batteries periodically.

The remote's manual should provide the information on when you need to replace the batteries, which are commonly overlooked until the day the door refuses to open.



REPLACE WORN WEATHER-STRIPPING

Look at the sides and bottom of your door. There should be weather-stripping on the sides and a rubber weather-seal on the bottom. If it's cracked or the weather-stripping on the sides is jamming the door, consider adjusting it or replacing it altogether.

Wooden garage doors might not have weather-stripping at the bottom. However, ideally, you should add weather-stripping to it, which can be purchased at any hardware store, and get it painted to protect the wood.

LUBRICATE MOVING PARTS

Garage doors are connected by springs, rollers, nuts and bolts. All of these moving parts are used constantly every time you press the remote, and the door opens and closes. Hence, it's vital to lubricate these moving parts with spray lubricant for springs, and white lithium grease for the chain or screw.

Don't smear lubricant on the track, because it could cause the door to slip and lose its balance.



Use white lithium-grease to lubricate the chain and screw of an automatic garage door opener.

SAFETY TIPS FOR GARAGE DOORS

"When you think about it, the garage door is likely the most used door to your home," says Jeffrey Nofziger, president of Haas Door in Wauseon, Ohio. "Your garage door opens and closes several times a day. Ensuring that it's operating efficiently and safely is a smart move for homeowners.

The following are a few tips to make sure your garage door operates as safely as possible.

Replace Old Springs. Your garage door's springs are arguably the most important and most dangerous part of your door. Springs wear out. When they break, injury can result. If you have an older garage door, have your springs inspected by a professional technician and replaced if needed. If your door has two springs, replace both, even if one is not broken. This will not only prevent any damage caused by the breaking of the second spring, but also keep your door working efficiently.

Check Your Cables. Visually inspect the cables that attach the spring system to the bottom brackets on both sides of the door. If these cables are frayed or worn, they are in danger of breaking, which can cause injury. Due to the dangers associated with high spring tension, these cables should be replaced only by a trained, professional technician.

Use a Safety Cable. If your garage door has extension springs, you need a safety cable that runs through the spring and secures to the wall or ceiling at each end. When your garage door is down, extension springs are under high tension. If the spring breaks, it may cause injury. A safety cable can keep that broken spring contained. If you have extension springs but do not have a safety cable, call your local dealer for a safety inspection.

Watch Your Fingers! Every year, many unsuspecting homeowners injure their fingers by placing them between the door sections to pull down on the door. If your door lacks pinch-resistant joints, you should have lift handles or suitable gripping points on the inside and outside of the door. Even if your door has an opener, the door must occasionally be operated manually. Never place your fingers between the door sections. If you manually open or close the door, use the handles or the safe gripping points.

Use the Old Track? When buying a replacement garage door, some homeowners are tempted to save a few dollars by putting the new door on the old track. However, your old track may not fit with your new door, depending on the thickness of your sections, the weight of the door, the headroom required, the location of the garage door opener, and other considerations. The track and sections work together as a system. For maximum performance and long life, you should use the track that is designed for your specific door.

Man the Manual. Keep the owner's manuals for your door and opener hanging near the door for easy reference. Every model of door and opener has specific safety instructions unique to that model. Where is your manual?

EXAMINE THE CABLES

Cables are responsible for lifting your door. Examine them periodically for damage. If you notice signs of wear and tear, contact a garage door repair service rather than take matters into your own hands. High-tension cables have the ability to inflict serious injuries and should always be handled by a professional.

TEST THE SAFETY DEVICE

Every door is equipped with two safety features which are mechanical and photocell. To test the mechanical safety feature, simply hold a piece of wood or brick below it and close the door. Once the door comes in contact with the wooden piece, it should automatically reverse its direction



Periodically test the safety devices of the garage door, such as the photo-eye sensors at the bottom corners.

and go up. If it doesn't, you will need to adjust the downforce control limit. Read your opener's manual for directions on how to adjust it.

The second safety feature, photocell which uses photo-eye sensors, are located at the bottom of your garage door and have a beam. They prevent the door from

closing if an object is in the door's path. You can test this feature by closing the door and placing an object quickly in the path of the beam. If the door stops closing, it's in good working condition. If it doesn't, clean the sensors with a damp cotton ball and retry the process.

STOP FLOOR SQUEAKS

In Carpeted, Hardwood and Linoleum floors with **Squeeeeek No More***

DO IT YOURSELF

REMOVE RUST

Rust tends to accumulate on steel doors. Locate the rusted areas, sand, prime and finally paint over them. Wooden doors should also be examined for damages and kept painted for protection.

KEEP THE TRACKS CLEAN

Dirty tracks can hinder the opening/closing action of the door. Talk to a garage door specialist in order to get the best cleaner for the tracks on your door. Note: Do not lubricate the tracks or use an all-purpose cleaner on them.

CLEAN THE DOOR

Last but certainly not the least, it's imperative to wash your garage door with an all-purpose cleaner. You can do it while washing your

cars during the weekend and make it a fun family activity. Cleaning removes built-up grease and gunk and maintains your house's spotless appearance.

Use the aforementioned garage door maintenance tips to ensure that your door lasts long and saves you on repair costs. Most of these suggestions are easy to follow and only take a few minutes. It's also a good idea to call a garage door repairman to conduct biannual inspections. Always keep your door clean, fully-functional and safe throughout the year. **EHT**

BALANCE A GARAGE DOOR THAT HAS EXTENSION SPRINGS

To test the balance of a garage door that has extension springs, first move the garage door up and down until you find a place where the door stays suspended when you let go. If it doesn't stay in place when roughly halfway open, you will need to balance the door.

First prop the door open with a stepladder or sawhorse to remove tension from the springs. Once the spring is safely free of tension, remove it from its track hanger. If the door was closing too quickly, move the spring to the next higher hole on the bracket. If the door was opening too quickly, move it to the next lower hole. Adjust the springs on both sides of the door the same way, the retest the door balance.



Close the door and use a bubble level to determine the door is level across the bottom when it contacts the ground. If this is not the case, adjust the spring tension on each side of the door until it



To make fine adjustments, you can adjust the lifting cable instead of the spring. The cable is attached to the door and runs to an S-hook that attaches to the track support. With the door propped open, take the S-hook out of the support, and tighten or loosen the cable as needed.



AIN OFFICE By Larry Walton SHORK SHOP

he situation comes up more often than you might think. Someone needs a room or two inside a larger structure. It can be inside a garage, a shop, a barn or some type of a commercial structure. The uses for this separate space are varied. Sometimes it's an office or a bathroom (or both) in the corner of the shop. Sometimes it's intended to house sensitive computer equipment or to build engines in a controlled environment. It can be used to stock parts, house tools, provide a cozy break room, or to hang a deer or two.

Whatever the use, creating these small rooms in larger structures is often more like building a building inside a building than simply making a partition or two. Making a separate, warmer (or cooler), cleaner, more secure or quieter environment often involves a roof structure as well as walls.

For the project featured here, the need was for a small 8x10-ft. office inside a larger workshop space. The office would provide a cleaner environment for computer equipment, a place to get in out of the cold, and a way to secure valuables when friends of friends come to check on car projects. As an added bonus, the roof structure was built to deck specs to provide additional storage space.



We needed this structure to be as freestanding as possible because it was a rented space, and the office would potentially need to be removed (although we find that the owners or next tenants are often happy to take advantage of our improvements). If you can tie into the existing wall, you can use a ledger board and joist hangers in place of one of the framed walls.

Not a lot of planning went into the design, just enough to get a decent material list. Since we were working in a finished corner of the shop, we could get away with framing three walls. Why not two? Because two opposing walls were necessary to support the storage deck that would act as a roof for the office.

Materials consisted of a stack of 2x4 for studs and plates, 2x6 for headers and joists, plywood for the deck, and drywall. The stud layout and joist layout were 16 in. on center (O.C.). Door and window openings were planned with a recycled pre-hung door and a double-pane patio panel already on site.

If you need a small space inside a big space, this project can be quite useful. Here's how we got it done.

STEP BY STEP



The project started with a nice clean open space on clean concrete and drywall walls.



We framed the first wall on the floor and leaned it against the back wall. Note that the corner stud is set back a couple of inches on the plates for the conduit.



We framed the door wall next, because the plate lengths and stud layouts matched the first wall.



After framing the third wall, we put the door wall back on the floor and positioned the first wall and the end wall, and tacked them together.

We tipped the final wall into place to complete the enclosure.

After aligning the walls, we nailed the corners together.







The walls were further tied together by adding a top plate that overlapped the joints where the bottom plates met. This double plate design adds strength to the deck support.



We followed the stud layouts with joists sitting on the top plates. The joists spanned the short

direction across the room. The joists ended 1-1/2 inches back from the edge of the plate on the front wall to allow for a rim joist.

The rim joist capped off the joist bays to tie the joists together.

We cut the first sheet of plywood to break in the middle of a joist. The joist layout allowed full sheets from there.

The storage deck was finished with with 3/4-in. plywood.

We added drywall. Note that we went right over the window and door openings with full sheets.

We cut out the window and door openings after nailing and screwing off the drywall but before hanging drywall on the inside.

We ripped window sills to the net thickness of the window wall, including framing and drywall.



We nailed the window surround into a box before installing it into the window opening.



The pre-hung recycled door and jamb were installed next.



We installed the first set of window stops into the window opening.



We tipped the window (a recycled double-pane patio door panel) into place and locked it in with a second set of stops.



To complete the office, we added metal corner bead along the deck edge and on the vertical connection between walls before mudding the nails and taping the joints. **EHT**

SHELVES OF MANY SHAPES

helves come in all shapes and sizes. A single basic shelf has a very simple design: Just screw two right-angle brackets at the same height on a couple of wall studs then attach a flat board to the tops and *voilà*—you've got a shelf. Shelves are everywhere, from bookcases and built-ins to mantle shelves, closets and cubbies. Here's a look at a few styles you can build yourself as well as some products you can purchase "off the shelf" or use as inspiration for your own designs.

KEEP IT CLASSIC

A traditional wood case for a shelves makes a popular DIY project. For stain-

grade shelves, you can use solid wood such as oak or pine for the sides, top and shelves, and use a matching veneered plywood for the back. For more economical paint-grade projects, you can use less expensive finger-jointed boards or all plywood.

As far as how to design a shelf case, the possibilities are endless regarding its height, width, depth and trim detail. You can assemble using general carpentry skills and fasten the joints in multiple different ways. You can fasten the shelves with dowels, pins, dadoes, cleats or pocket screws.

For DIY'ers, a pocket-screw jig provides an easy way to make a strong joint for

attaching shelves to a case. Pocket-hole joinery relies on a two-step process. First, use a special "stepped" drill bit to drill the pocket hole. The bit has a 1/2-in. diameter shank but also features a shoulder with a narrower tip that drills a pilot for the shaft of the screw. The bit's 1/2-inch shank bores a pilot hole to house the wider head of the screw.

This initial pocket hole is drilled at an offset angle with the help of a special jig (shown in blue).





Simply clamp the jig onto the edge of the boards and drill through the jig's guide holes, which hold the bit at a precise angle.

The depth of the pocket hole and the length of the screw depend on the thickness of the wood you're joining (indicated with alignment markings on the jig). Drill the holes, add wood glue along the mating edges of the boards, reassemble and then drive in the pocket screws to secure the joint.



A few more design tips for a shelf case:



• Use right-angle clamps to hold the shelves in place when fastening.



- For adjustable shelves, make "shelf standards" that line the sides with parallel holes to use with removable pins as shelf supports.
- For tall cases, add stability to the bottom by attaching a "toe" plate that extends beyond the face.
- Secure tall cases at the top with a safety strap that connects the case to the wall to prevent them from tipping over.



GO WITH RUSTIC

Rustic furniture is now very popular, characterized by a mixture of industrial elements such as metal pipes, angle iron, chains or even rebar, combined with organic materials like stained wood.

The metal elements are often painted black to protect them from

rust as well as to enhance the "mechanical" aspect of the style—plus black goes with everything. The wood is often darkly stained and even distressed for an aged appearance.

One particularly fun aspect of building rustic furniture is that its character comes from its rough, rugged appearance, so dents or dings in the finish look that they were meant to be there. This makes construction of rustic furniture go a lot quicker and with less stress than taking the traditional carpentry approach, where you fuss over every little aspect of the wood surface as you assemble, sand and finish the project.

The *EHT* staff recently built simple rustic shelving using lumber shelves supported by galvanized pipe brackets. The shelving for this project was cut from simple 2×10 lumber. Each shelf bracket consisted of one 10-in. pipe (threaded on both ends), an end cap and a floor flange. We settled on using 3/4-in. pipe for a strong, sturdy look, and each of the four 30-in. shelves required two brackets. The pipes and fittings have matching threads, so they simply screw together for assembly.





To paint the pipe brackets, we used a black Rustoleum spray paint (and primer in one) that offers a special hammered texture to the metal finish. The project also requires heavy-duty screws to mount the brackets into the wall studs, wood stain for the shelves, and polyurethane for a protective top coat.

SHELVES OF MANY SHAPES

The shelf lumber was cut to size, and we distressed the surface with a variety of tools to give it the appearance of age and damage. We smacked the boards with a heavy trucker chain to give it dents

and dips. A handful of 1/2-in. nuts threaded over a heavy-duty wire can be used to whip sharper dents and dings into the surface. A simple punch tool can provide pinholes reminiscent of worm or

insect damage. And when used sparingly, the waffle face of a framing hammer can create an interesting relief pattern.

Add your stain of choice to the wood, then screw the brackets as shelf supports into the studs for secure mounting. We laid the shelves on top and let gravity hold them in place, or you can fasten them to the brackets if you prefer.





Beyond shelf brackets, you can use similar metal elements to construct all sort of industrial frames to serve as shelf cases, then add your wood shelves in any number of creative ways.

FLOATING SHELVES

Floating shelves are basically made of flat, hollow boxes that have no visible mounting hardware. Depending on the method of construction, the hollow shelf mounts to either metal rods or a wooden cleat that fit inside the rear of the box and supports it from within. The rods or cleat are fastened securely into the wall studs for the best holding power.

One thing to consider when designing these shelves is the hollow nature of the construction. Since the mounting cleat usually only extends about 2 inches into the shelf, the shelf must be lightweight and well-balanced so as



FLOATING CLOSET


This bedroom had no storage. The homeowner wanted a closet plus storage shelves, but the room was already very small, and adding a partition wall to enclose new storage space didn't make sense. Without occupying more space inside the room, the only option was to find storage outside the room, which is usually prevented by having exterior walls or another room on the opposite side of the interior walls. In this case, however, the bedroom was oriented adjacent to a large garage with a lower floor than that of the room. The creative design solution: A series of half-height "floating" closet/cabinets built into the wall between the bedroom and garage, providing ample storage while economizing interior space, all without encroaching on the usable living space inside the garage. Our staff thought this approach was pretty clever, so we thought we'd share it here.





not to pull away from the fasteners that hold it to the cleat.

The EHT staff recently built some shelves with the upper and lower panels made of thin 1/4-in. plywood-not exactly heavy-duty material. For this reason, it's smart to limit the size of these shelves to a fairly shallow depth. Ours extended only 6 inches away from the wall.



The front and side edges of the shelves were made of the 2×2 pine material, while the upper and lower panels were 1/4-in. staingrade birch plywood. To ensure a flat, flush shelf surface, we cut 1/4-in. deep rabbets along the upper and lower edges of the 2×2's. When arranged as the sides of the box, these rabbets form an interior channel or trough for the plywood.

We cut the mounting cleats to fit snugly inside the channels at the back of the shelf boxes. To mount the shelves, make sure the cleats are fastened securely into the wall framing and cross at least two studs. Slide the floating shelf boxes over the cleats and screw them from the top surface down into the cleats.

Chiminea Turned Pizza Cooker

A Great Summertime DIY Welding Project

First-time welder? No problem. With some ambition, inspiration and a Forney Easy Weld machine, you can create your next backyard project. Having a fire pit, chiminea, smoker and wood-fired pizza oven can take up a lot of space on your back patio. Why not combine all of them and create a chiminea pizza cooker? Not only will it cook up delicious pizza, but sitting next to the fire and roasting marshmallows will provide some warmth on those cool summer nights.

Tools and Materials:

- Forney Easy Weld 125 FC or 140 FC-i
- Large to medium compressor tank
- 4' x 8' expanded metal sheet
- 1/8" x 2" x 6' flat stock
- 4 metal hinges
- 2' of 2" round tubing (for the feet)
- Angle grinder with cut off wheels and flap discs
- 3 toggle pull latches
- 2' of 6" or 8" diameter pipe (for the chimney)
- 2' of 1/2" angle iron
- 1' x 1', 1/4" steel plate (for the chimney cover)
- Magnets
- Chalk

PROJECT PREP

Wearing the proper personal protective equipment is essential when metalworking and welding. Always remember to wear a flame-resistant welding jacket or apron and sleeves, welding gloves, safety glasses and a welding helmet. Arc flash and sparks can

be detrimental, so protecting yourself is crucial.

Sketch out your idea on paper so you have an idea of the design you're looking for. You can make this as simple or complex as needed. We knew we wanted a taller tank to fit that chiminea look, but something slim that wouldn't take up much space on a patio.


We found an old air compressor tank to fit this project, but you can also use a large propane tank that fits your desired size. Clean the tank with soap and water to ensure nothing is left inside. Mark up your design on the tank using chalk. We marked out a lower fire door, two back open sides, and a top door for the pizza.

Pro Tip: If the base of your

tank is round and cannot stand on its own, use a bucket to help prop it up.

STEP BY STEP ASSEMBLY

Use a cutting wheel to cut out the lower fire door first. Then cut out the two back panels. Make sure the two back open sides are below the pizza door to ensure proper heating of the pizza chamber. Next, cut the pizza door.



Once both pizza and lower fire doors are cut, weld hinges from the door to the compressor tank. Both doors get two hinges, one on the top of the door and one on the bottom. Next, cut expanded metal to cover the back open sides and weld this to the compressor tank. This ensures the fire is contained but heat can get out and oxygen can get in.

Cut 1/2-in. angle iron to weld to the back of the pizza door to prevent warping. On the lower fire door, cut out the middle section and replace it with expanded metal. Weld the expanded metal, as well as a 1/2-in. piece of angle iron to the back of the door.



Next, create a chimney. Begin by cutting out the top center of the tank. Make sure the cut is directly in the center. Cut the chimney proportionate to your compressor tank size. Weld your 6- to 8-in. diameter pipe to the compressor tank, both on the inside and outside to create a stronger weld.

Make a cap for the top of the chimney that will be used to protect it when not in use (optional). The cap will be made from the 1-by-1-ft. steel plate. Cut the steel plate in a tear drop shape to the diameter of the chimney. The teardrop point will be used to attach the hardware to the chimney to create a swivel effect. Close the cap when not in use to protect it from the weather and swivel it open when in use.





The next step is to build the legs. Cut round tubing to desired length. Make sure all four legs are equal and level, and then tack weld them into place. Once the stability is on point, complete the welds



Add the finishing trim on the pizza door. Use the 1/8-in. plate, 2-in. wide metal strip and cut to appropriate size to fit the exterior pizza door. Weld these strips to every side of the pizza door except the hinge side. On the inside of the compressor tank, weld a 1/8-in. plate, 2-in. wide metal strip to the hinge side only.



Attach the toggle pull latches to the door. Two will be used for the pizza chamber and one for the lower fire door.

Make handles for the pizza door and the fire door.



To create the pizza shelf, weld angle iron in small 1- to 2-in. pieces around the inside of the compressor tank. Cut expanded metal to the diameter of the inner compressor tank to rest on top of the angle-iron pieces. Tack weld expanded metal to the angle iron.

Create a fire grate similar to the



pizza shelf on the bottom of the compressor tank for the wood to sit on.

If you realize your chiminea pizza oven needs more heat, create back plates using the original cut-outs from the air compressor (optional).

Lastly, drill holes in the bottom of the compressor tank below the fire grate so oxygen can get to the fire

You can cook pizza, smoke burgers or roast marshmallows this summer with your very own chiminea pizza cooker! Make the chiminea cooker your own and customize it to fit your needs. We powder-coated it to protect it from the weather, but you can use high-temperature paint or if you like the rusty look, you can leave it as is.



build raised planter beds for his vegetable garden. "I did some research, looked at some garden plans online, and decided that I would attempt to build a raised bed. Manager of Lonza Wood Protection, choosing the right wood for its intended use is imperative for a finished project to last. Jay explains that consumers can either purchase Above Ground or Ground Contact preserved wood for their project. "This decision rests on the severity of the exposure of the wood during its service. Ground Contact preserved wood is treated to a higher retention level than Above Ground," explains Jay. "That simply means there is more preservative in Ground Contact preserved wood to offer necessary protection for more demanding end uses like raised beds."

Further guidelines say that Above Ground preserved wood is intended for the parts of a project that are at least 6 inches above the ground, where the wood dries easily, and where it is well-ventilated around all the boards. While Ground Contact preserved wood is versatile enough to be used in almost any application, it must be used in applications where the wood:

- will come in contact with or be within 6 inches of the ground or fresh water
- is critical to the structure and difficult to repair or replace



What is the Best Way to Flush a Radiator?



aybe you've taken your car in for some recent service and the mechanic let you know you needed a cooling system flush. Or perhaps you noticed your vehicle was a little low on coolant, and when you went to top it off you noticed some gunk floating in the overflow tank or radiator. Or, my personal favorite, you go to turn the heat on and you only get cold air even after your vehicle is well warmed up.

These all are good indications that it may indeed by time for a radiator flush, or more accurately a cooling system flush. But how did all the gunk get into your radiator, the cap has been on tight for years, so there shouldn't be any way for contamination to get in there—right? If all the gunk that

clogged up your heater core didn't come from outside your engine, then it must be coming from your engine. Is there something wrong, or is something about to break?

Before you go pulling the engine out of your car in search of bigger problems, let's figure out why your cooling system needs to be flushed even though it is a closed system. Antifreeze, it turns out, is more than just green water that doesn't mind the cold weather. The main ingredient in Antifreeze is ethylene glycol and it is the chemical that allows antifreeze to stay liquid even in extremely cold temperatures. Also included in antifreeze is a certain mix of lubricants and corrosion inhibitors. Usually, water and steel don't mix well, and the steel will rust quickly. The corrosion inhibitors in the antifreeze slow this process but never stop it completely. Also, these corrosion inhibitors have a finite life span in your cooling system and after time will start to allow more rapid corrosion to occur.

The biggest cause for increased corrosion in your vehicle's cooling system is improperly mixed antifreeze. Many off-the-shelf antifreeze options require mixing with water before they are added to your vehicle. If you use water from your tap to mix with your antifreeze, you are adding a whole new spectrum of chemicals to your coolant, many of which can be harmful to your vehicle. Even filtered tap water has minerals dissolved in it, especially if you have "hard" water, and many areas have high levels of iron or other metals in the water. Also, chlorine is the most common chemical found in tap water used to kill bacteria and make sure the water is safe to drink. Chlorine is also a very strong corrosive agent, and if added to your vehicle's cooling system can greatly increase corrosion.

Steel isn't your only concern for corrosion particles in your cooling system. Aluminum, copper and brass also can corrode, releasing particles, and the rubber hoses and gasket can deteriorate over time adding to your cooling system gunk.

So now that you're worried about what may be lurking in your radiator, let's look at how to flush your cooling system. First, go to your favorite auto parts store and



pick up a bottle of BlueDevil Radiator Flush. BlueDevil Radiator flush has a concentrated formula with powerful cleaning agents designed to remove any gunk or scale from your cooling system without damaging any of the components. Drain the coolant from your radiator by opening the drain valve on the bottom of your radiator. Next, drain the coolant from your engine block by opening the block drain also. Make sure to catch all of the coolant in a drain pan, and take it to your local coolant recycling facility or auto parts store.

After draining, close both drains. Add BlueDevil Radiator flush to your radiator, then refill the cooling system with water. Start your vehicle and let the engine idle for 15 to 30 minutes depending on how long it has been since your last coolant flush. Be sure to watch your vehicle's temperature gauge carefully during this time to ensure it does not overheat.

Drain the water and flush the solution in the same way you drained the original coolant. For heavily corroded or high-mileage vehicles, consider removing the hoses from your radiator and heater core and using a spray nozzle on a hose to inject high-pressure water through the



Once your cooling system is empty, close the drains as before. Refill your cooling system with the vehicle manufacturer's recommended type and amount of coolant. Be sure to read the instructions on the antifreeze you purchase. Some may require mixing with water, while others may be pre-diluted. Often times it is less expensive to purchase antifreeze that requires dilution. If you choose to go this route, purchase 1 gallon of distilled water for every gallon of antifreeze. Using distilled water in your cooling system will ensure you are not adding any foreign minerals or chlorine to your vehicle.

Once your system is refilled, start your vehicle and let it idle until it reaches normal operating temperature. Watch the temperature gauge carefully to ensure your vehicle is not overheating. Let it idle at normal temperature for about 10 minutes, then shut the car off and let every cool until it is cold to the touch. Once everything has cooled, recheck the coolant level in your radiator and overflow reservoir and fill them to the recommended level. Now you can close your hood and drive with confidence! **EHT**
