cally built using two layers of brick, or a concrete block with a layer of brick for the exterior. As a building material, brick is fireproof, durable and can withstand environmental conditions like earthquakes or heavy winds. Brick construction doesn't require wood, so you won't have to worry about termites or decay. It's a lowmaintenance material that has excellent color retention. Brick is expensive, however, and for just the materials, you could pay between \$6 and \$15 per square foot. Factoring professional installation, materials and labor could range between \$14 and \$30 per square foot.

Brick veneer is a technique that utilizes non-structural materials to create the look and feel of brick. While solid brick homes are built to structurally support a house, brick veneer relies on the house for reinforcement, usually steel and wooden frames. The brick veneer is added as siding. Brick veneer is a more costeffective way to get the look and feel of solid brick, averaging \$4.00 to \$10.00 per square foot. Since brick veneer is much easier to install than solid brick, you can also bypass the cost of hiring a mason. Veneer can be added at any point during construction and is a much better insulator, and the air cavities between the brick veneer and exterior of a home will help keep moisture out.

How do I paint over furniture that has been coated in polyurethane?

• The tried and true method for refinishing furniture is to strip or sand down to bare wood. Another option is to use a chemical to etch the polyurethane prior to recoating. First, thoroughly wash the surface, using

TSP for heavy-duty cleaning. Etch and de-gloss the surface with 100-grit abrasive. You should see light scratches in the old finish. Vacuum all sanding dust and wipe all woodwork with a clean, damp cloth. Using a rag saturated in Liquid Surface Preparation agent, apply the chemical to the finished wood to agitate the surface, following the directions on the container. Apply primer to the treated surface within thirty minutes.

Why aren't "carbidetipped" drill bits and saw blades made completely of carbide?

 Carbide (specifically tungsten carbide and titanium carbide) is a common material used for cutting tools such as saw blades, router bits, lathe bits and masonry drill bits. Carbide is used for the cutting edge because it stays sharper longer than most other materials and can hold an edge ten to twenty times longer than steel. The carbide tips are brazed onto the steel body of the blade or bit. The blades and bits aren't made entirely of carbide because they would be very expensive, but also because the body would be very brittle, and steel is less likely to crack or shatter. **EHT**

Clean your Driveway, the Right Way

Remove Rust Spots from Asphalt

t's easy to know the right thing to do after you've made a mistake.

A few months back, I was cutting a bunch of metal rods (rebar) and did not anticipate all the microscopic metal dust remaining on my driveway and leaving unsightly rust stains.

My first thought was to pressurewash the driveway. However, rust comes from a chemical reaction and pressure-washing is typically not enough to remove it.

SPOT-CLEANING

Instead, I spot-treated the rust spots with an acid-based stain remover.

I've used ZEP's Calcium, Lime Scale, and Rust remover (called ZEP CLR for short) on a few remodeling projects in the past, as when salvaging claw-foot tubs with heavy mineral staining, and the product worked amazingly well. ZEP is a timetested, professional-grade cleaner that's been around for 80 years.

To begin, use the CLR remover on a small, inconspicuous spot to test it before using on the entire stained area. It needs to be rinsed off quickly, so keep a hose handy.

MIXING THE CLR SOLUTION


The ZEP Calcium, Lime Scale, and Rust remover is a fast-acting,

concentrated cleaner. Here's the best approach to using it for rust stains on a driveway:

- **1.** Mix a 50/50 solution using warm water.
- **2.** Apply to stained surfaces with a stiff-bristle brush.
 - 3. Rinse after 5-10 minutes.
- **4.** Perform a second application at full strength, if needed.
 - 5. Rinse again.
- **6.** It's important to always read the manufacturer's label and follow their instructions.

PRESSURE-WASH THE DRIVEWAY

Once the rust stain was treated, I used Zep Driveway and Concrete Pressure Wash Cleaner Concentrate in my pressure washer to clean the entire driveway surface.

I simply add this cleaner to my pressure washer's detergent reservoir and I'm good to go. As both a remodeling contractor and

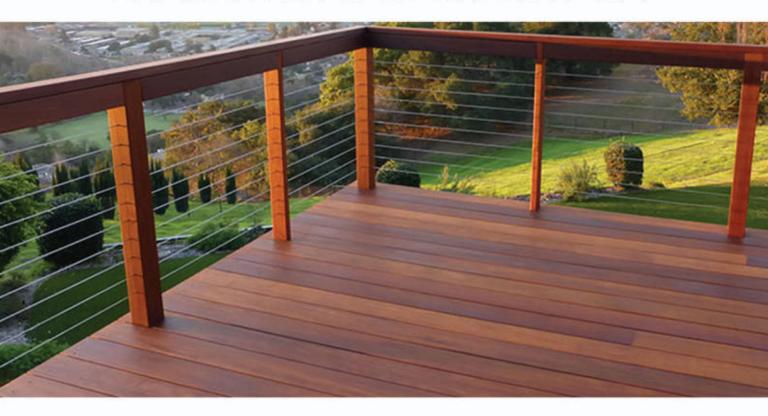
a homeowner, I like constructiongrade, concentrated cleaners like this, because there's no futzing around, I simply add the cleaner to the pressure washer and get the job done fast.

The Zep Pressure Wash Cleaner is designed to remove tough oil stains and grime from asphalt, brick, concrete or other aggregate surfaces. (It is not intended for painted or wood surfaces that will not be refinished.)

PRESSURE-WASHING STEPS

1. Wet all surrounding vegetation and grass with pure water. Saturate the soil to avoid plants from soaking up chemical overspray. (You can also cover plants with plastic if desired.)

QUICK FIX

- **2.** Most driveways have a slope, so you should work on the uphill side of the slope.
- **3.** Apply the cleaner to the driveway at low pressure, working in manageable sections.
- **4.** Keep the surface wet, reapplying the cleaner as needed.
- **5.** Allow the cleaner to soak in for 5-10 minutes.
- **6.** Pressure-wash the surface in sections, working in a down-slope direction.

When cleaning concrete, a stiff-bristle brush will help work the cleaner into the porous surface.







Use The Drywall Axe to determine your measurement, lock it in place, then transfer it to your drywall or other material to mark, score or cut in one easy motion.



Pro Tip: The Zep Driveway and Concrete Pressure Wash Cleaner requires you to use a pressure washer with a downstream chemical injector. Downstream injection introduces the chemical into the system after the pump, so no chemical will be run through the pressure-washer pump.

FINAL THOUGHTS

Like I said earlier, a little foresight may have prevented the need to do this project, but that's life. Stuff happens, and we have to deal with it. The key is to use

the right tools to get the job done safely, efficiently and effectively.

By following these steps using a pressure washer and a well-known, pro-grade cleaner, you'll be well on your way to a clean driveway, walkway or patio. **EHT**



regal rail.

could write entire articles on the individual phases of this porch renovation. I could dive deep with more than a thousand words on demolition alone or on the cedar ceiling of succulence (it really is luscious—all clear tongue-and-groove). Or I could focus on the bespoke handrail I made from Regal Rail's

ornamental metal parts and cedar parts I fabricated on site. However, I'd probably make our friendly editor go crazy, so instead I decided to hit on the high points.

By hitting the high points, I can touch on all the cool aspects and cover some time-saving tips for both pros and DIY'ers.

If you've never remodeled a porch before—or never done one quite like this, and it's a first for me-it's got some super unique details. I think taking a wide view with photos and captions will give you an idea of what you're in for, and where you can go on your porch project with a little imagination.

Porches are usually populated, so make a plan and set aside some time to place items out of the way.

Hoo else is going to move all this stuff if I don't. Owl tell you: Nobody. (This pun stuff is for the birds.)

Avoid pounding materials with a hammer during demolition. Cut whenever possible. The reciprocating saw worked great here.





The ceiling was made of aluminum. Held tight to the framing with roofing nails, that thing was not going to leave easily. Rather than rip and pull at it, thereby applying asymmetric forces to something installed with symmetric forces, I kerfed it with a grinder so I could get tools behind it and pull it down in the opposite direction it was installed.

Also, ripping metal apart means you basically turn all the torn edges into blades. Don't do that. I get shivers down my spine just thinking about a yucky slice wound.

BEFORE

There wasn't much wrong with the existing porch. It was 30 years old and plain, but it was well built with sound materials (lots of Western Red Cedar) and easily could have been tuned up. But, the customer wanted a specific look, so that's what we set out to achieve.

DEMOLITION

The first thing to go was the ceiling fan. It would be reused. To hedge my bets against the



inevitable lost screw, I captured everything in duct tape then taped everything to the body of the ceiling fan.



With the ceiling down, I was able to get at the strapping above it. I used the NestorBars demo bar—a contractor-invented thing of beauty. If you're tearing up a deck or doing almost any demolition at all, it's a must have. It also works as a great lever for lifting stuff up.



Backstory: After I got the ceiling down, the customer walked out and said, "How do we get rid of those horizontal boards?"

I answered, "By altering the permit," which I did. The inspector let me delete all of them. More on that later. Here, clean cuts and ample leverage are our friends. I cross-cut the joists with a circular saw. Once free, I carefully pried and twisted them off the ledger.



With the joists rough cut, I snapped a line 2 inches out from the beam so I could transition up and into the bottom of the rafters. This is a very specific detail, but the point is that if



you vault a ceiling like this, you're going to get into framing that was never meant to be trimmed (the beam) and framing that was never meant to see the light of day. The key is transitioning between the two carefully. It requires some careful planning, layout, and seeing into the future.

The same thing is happening here: Transitioning from the framing meant to, in this case,



no framing at all. So, in order to flatten the gable ends to accept the cedar later, I had to add studs and integrate with the trim elevation.



A couple things are happening in this photo. First, look at the jack and the squash plate it sits on. I crank that up just enough to wiggle the existing post out and put the new post in. Not shown to my left (because it is hard to build these and shoot a media package at the same time) is the friction-fit 2x4 safety

post, in case something didn't go right. Finally, note the new post. It's my patented* 2x6-2x4-2x6 laminated post.

*Okay, it's not patented. Anybody can do this, but I'm hoping I invented it. I'll put it on my urn. "Here lies the dust of the guy who invented the builtup post."

The reason the porch roof has to be lifted when placing the posts is due to geometry. A rectangle is longer on the diagonal than it is end to end. Even if I



tried to make all the post cuts super-exact, there would be no way to just tip in a new post in. By the way, this same geometry is the reason you can't tip up a framed wall in a basement remodel and have it be tall enough. It is also why the run of a hip rafter is 17-inches, not 12-inches like a common rafter.



Before installing the post, I use Spax PowerLag structural screws to fasten the plate on top of the post down into it. This is both structural and decorative. I install the post next. Then, right along the centerline of the plate I drive PowerLags up into the girder. These things aren't going anywhere any time soon.

The center ply of the threepiece post is left 5-1/2 inches short so I can slide a decorative corbel into the center ply. This



provides the molding detail my customer is looking for, and it gives me a way to hide the large screw heads locking the post to the framing.



To get around having no horizontal members below (the ceiling joists we removed), I fastened the ridge ledger to the studs with more PowerLag structural screws (1/4 x 5-in.) right into framing.

Next, we installed Rockwool my favorite insulation ever—in the ceiling joists. The idea is that it stops summer heat from radiating through the roof assembly and heating up the space



beneath. (Not my idea.) Cutting Rockwool on edge is a fast way to size it, and it cuts easily with a bread knife. Did it work?



You bet it worked. It was a noticeable difference in comfort. Plus, friction-fitting the Rockwool between the rafters is approximately 34,000 times better than smashing paper ears on other insulation with the slap stapler.



I then installed the transition molding around the rafter stubs.

The particular rafter shown here was crowned, so when I nailed the cedar to it, it cupped,



and installing the next straight groove onto a curved tongue is nearly impossible. So, using my "use it every day" Hyde multitool, I'm prying the cedar back into plane.

The cedar is installed with the tongue up and toe-nailed with 15-gauge finish nails.

"Bespoke" means it's made from scratch to your specifications, and the bespoke handrail I made has several components, mainly a 2-piece top and bottom cap assembly (total of 4 pieces). The caps are simply 2x6 boards ripped to fit between the posts and beveled to shed water and

deliver a nice look. All of that is done on the table saw.

The Regal Rail pickets come next. Integrating these parts—parts that were never meant to be integrated—was the biggest of the big challenges on this project. The payoff was awesome.

Before assembling the metal and wood parts, I applied a coat of latex stain to the rail caps. Using the Hyde StirWhip is my





new favorite way to mix any coating. It's fast, clean and awesome. (Hyde doesn't pay me to say that, by the way).

The decorative pickets are solid aluminum. I cut those

to length—37-1/2 inches—then pre-drilled pilot holes in my rails on layout. I propped up the Regal Rail so I could install it on the center line of my beveled piece. I then fastened it with a stainless-steel screw. I used stainless because it is softer than hardened steel. It worked.

Round Regal Rail balusters were integrated as well. These have what I call "receiver lugs"



and are easy to install. They must, however, be cut exactly 1/8 inch shorter than the other balusters, so everything snugs up tightly. I know, this requires lots of steps, but give me a break. I'm making this up as I go.





With all the handrail pieces mated up and snugged, toescrews driven into the post lock it together.

To wrap it all up, I drive screws through the bottom of the rail assembly and into the top cap. There's not a screw head to be seen.

I'm leaving a lot out, but this is the gist of the project. You can vault and clad the ceiling, which is an awesome design detail. You cannot lose your ceiling fan hardware because

it's taped to the ceiling fan. You can pre-stain your porch parts. And, insulation is oddly appropriate outside—whodathunk?

Ceilings can soar and rails can be regal. What's not to like? Front-porching should be a sport. **EHT**

WORKSHOP IN PROGRESS

shudder to think how many hours of my life I've spent searching for lost tools or equipment. When you tackle a lot of home projects, tools and supplies get moved around and often misplaced or hidden by associated clutter. The result of all the searching due to disorganization can be a big, aggravating waste of time.

Having moved to a new home last year, I no longer have a detached garage as my workshop. Frankly, this breaks my heart, but such is life. Now I'm converting a basement garage into my project headquarters and reorganizing all my gear.

The three driving factors for setting up a home workshop are Organization, Storage and Visibility.

WHERE TO PUT WHAT

Organizing your tools in a logical manner makes it easy to know where to go to get what you need. Over the years I've developed a method for grouping tools by size, shape and application.

Organizing by size is often self-explanatory, because large items such as large table saws, miter saws, pressure washers and air compressors are heavy enough to require floor space. Aside from locating them in the most lightly trafficked area of the workshop, these things are generally stored wherever space is available and often become the obstacles around which to arrange the rest of the shop. The more large items you can store elsewhere—such as an outdoor shed—the more layout options and elbow room you'll have for everything else.

At the opposite end of the spectrum are very small items, which can be stored in cabinets and drawers. These easily stored items, however, can be difficult to find if they're stacked and concealed. To make things easy to find, I have a tool cabinet where I keep one drawer dedicated only to drill and driver bits. A second drawer holds blades for jigsaws, recip saws and other cutting tools. All the drawers are organized this way—sorting by both size and utility.

I have too many sockets and wrenches to occupy a single drawer, so I have an entire toolbox dedicated to storing box-end

wrenches, socket wrenches of vary-

ing sizes, a wide range of sockets and their corresponding extensions and fittings. I've found that keeping a toolbox full of these mechanical tools makes the entire kit easy to grab and go, when it's time for to work on an automobile or assemble furniture.

For the home handyman, the bulk of the small items will over time consist of accumulated fasteners in all shapes and sizes. From nuts

and bolts to nails and screws, I have too many boxes and too little space not to stack the containers. This can make finding the right box difficult, so I mitigate this by storing a sampling of the most commonly used fasteners in small labeled containers mounted to a wall.

After sorting the large items and small items, I store everything else either by shape or application. A rake and a shovel serve wholly different uses, but their long-handle designs mean I hang them side-by side, inches away from long-handled pry bars and push-brooms, because I've found doing

so to be an economical use of storage space.

Many of my power tools come in their own hard cases, which makes them flat and sturdy for easy stacking. In fact, a hot trend among manufacturers is to design stackable tool cases that interlock with similar cases above and below. I store my power tool cases stacked onto tool shelves, and top the cases with the "lumpier" tools that come in canvas bags.

Some tool categories don't match in shape or size but do in application, so I group them accordingly into bins, which I then stack on shelves. I have a bin full of painting tools—rollers, trays, brushes, tapes, sprayers, scrapers and more. I have another bin full of tile tools that includes grout floats, sponges, trowels, nippers, spacers, cutter, etc. Keep all these bins clearly labeled.

You might notice that words like "hang" and "stack" suggest a vertical means of storage, and this is to keep the floor space as unoccupied as possible to leave room to maneuver and allow ample square footage for a work table or benches. You'll find a zillion plans online to build your own plywood-and-lumber storage

shelves, or you can always install simple wall shelves using support brackets fastened to concrete or wall studs.

WALL-MOUNT STORAGE SYSTEMS

Wall-mount storage systems present another option. Slat-wall type wall storage systems are growing in popularity and for good reason: they're versatile, cleanlooking and store tools and supplies conveniently off the floor for easy-to-see organization. Most of these wall-panel systems are made from PVC and are sold under the names Proslat, FlowWall, and the VersaTrack system from Craftsman just to name a few. The panels are moisture-resistant and simple to clean, usually available in 4- to 8-foot lengths.

The panels install simply by screwing into the wall studs. Once installed, you can equip the walls with a variety of snap-in accessories, from baskets and shelves to a wide range of hooks. Depending on the accessory, these storage systems are strong enough to store shovels, sledge hammers, string trimmers and more. You'll even find wall brackets with the holding capacity to store a ladder a few feet off the floor.


For smaller tools, arranging tools on a pegboard panel is a





tried and true way to keep items in plain view and easy to grab. When a fiberboard pegboard won't cut it, there's AlligatorBoard manufactured from 20-gauge steel to be much stronger and more durable than ordinary pegboard. The metal won't warp, tear, dis-color or rust, and AlligatorBoard features strength-reinforcing dimpled holes, making it easier to install tool hooks than on other pegboards.

For any type of pegboard, hardware stores sell a huge variety of clips, hooks, holders, and clamps


that fit the handles and contours of hand tools ranging from screwdrivers and hammers to wrenches and squares.

WORKSHOP LIGHTING

Visibility is crucial to an organized workshop, and this requires good lighting. To upgrade the ceiling light in my garage-turned-workshop, I replaced an 8-foot fluorescent tube fixture with Striker Concepts' new MPI Multi-Point Illumination Motion Ceiling Light. Unlike a traditional single-point light fixture, the MPI creates five points of light from a single standard bulb fixture. These five lights are designed to illuminate all corners of the room and reduce shadows.

The MPI system is simple to install by simply screwing the

To upgrade the workshop lighting, we installed the new MPI Multi-Point Illumination System from Striker Concepts. The central light screws into a standard bulb outlet, and the surrounding four LED pods can extend up to 9 feet in any direction, so you can cast light right where you need it.

central hub into bulb fixture, so there is no need to hire an electrician. The surrounding light pods connect to the central hub with push-fit cables and extend up to 9.5 feet, where they can be screwed to the ceiling exactly where you need them. Simply twist the light pods to tighten the cables.


After installing the system, I'm pleased to report the combined light output of the MPI far outshines the 8-foot tube, lighting the peripheral edges of the room much more thoroughly than the old central fixture.

The MPI's motion sensor keeps the light off until I walk into the room, and a well-lit workshop is crucial to searching for all those tools that tend to go missing. **EHT**

8 Warning Signs of Foundation Issues

How to Identify Needed Repairs Before They Get Bad

hen it comes to foundations, time is of the essence. Catching a foundation problem early can save you time and money. Plus, you can rest easy knowing that your home is safe for you and your loved ones.

An unaddressed foundation problem can result in serious structural harm to your home, water damage leading to mold or mildew growth, as well as a drop in your home's resale value.

Your foundation is crucial to the integrity and safety of your home, so have the repair work done as soon as possible. If cost is a concern, check with your insurance company to see if the work is covered, or set up a payment plan or financing with the repair company.

Foundation repair isn't something you should do yourself, but watching for the warning signs of potential issues around your home is essential and easy. Pay special attention to the condition of your foundation if any of the following are true:

- Your region experiences extreme weather cycles or severe drought.
- Your home is built on highly expansive clay soil.
- You've had an underground plumbing leak.
- Large trees with roots grow beneath your home.

Signs of a foundation problem include doors and/or windows that stick, jam, or have locks that don't work due to uneven floors.

 Other houses nearby have had foundation issues.

SIGNS TO WATCH FOR AND FIX

When most DIY'ers see a minor issue with their home, they bust out their tools to repair it themselves. However, certain easy-to-fix imperfections may be signs of a bigger problem.

Cosmetic signs that your home's foundation has shifted include:

- · Corner cracks in your drywall
- Cracked, heaving, or sloping floors
- Exterior cracks in brick or stucco
- Gaps around the door or window frames, as well as the garage
- A chimney that is pulling away from the house
- Misaligned or sticking doors and windows
 - · Bowed basement walls
- Significant cracks in the foundation itself

Fixing these problems will improve the look of your home temporarily, but if the foundation isn't repaired, the issues will eventually return and get worse with

time. Put your tools down and call a foundation repair specialist to come to your home for an evaluation.

Repairing any cosmetic issues yourself can make it harder to diagnose and locate the underlying problem. The best time to fix these flaws is after your foundation has been stabilized by a professional crew. Once that's done, you can patch cracks or rehang doors until your heart's content.

It isn't uncommon for foundation repair to cost \$4,000 or more. After seeing your price estimates, you may be tempted to remedy the problem yourself. However, most professionals agree that this is not a good idea. Here's why:

- The average DIY'er won't be able to determine the severity of the problem.
- Inadequate repairs can bring down the value of your home.
- Special tools are required to get the job done.

- You could damage your home further.
- A professional may have to undo your work, which can add to the expense.

Keep in mind that most foundation repair companies provide free estimates, so there is no risk to have them out to assess the situation. The best companies also warranty their work. If you sell your home in the future, the warranty will transfer over.

WHAT'S THE BEST REPAIR METHOD?

The best way to repair a foundation is with piering or piling—a system that corrects foundation settlement and ensures it won't happen again. Steel piles are driven far into the ground, so they won't be affected by soil expansion or contraction. The number and placement of piers can be determined by a foundation repair contractor.

this type of repair is that you can keep living in your home as usual. There is minimal disruption, and no heavy equipment is needed. In some instances, you may also need wall tiebacks or carbon fiber to help support bowed basement walls. **EHT**


