




## **Best night-light** in history

About once a year here at the office, we encounter "The Perfect Product." This year the title winner has to be the SnapRays Guidelight. Even though it's just a lowly night-light, it's practically perfect in every way. Here's why:

- Everyone needs it: If the sun goes down where you live, you need a few night-lights, right?
- Anyone can install it: It takes all of 60 seconds. Remove the single screw on the old cover plate, snap in the Guidelight and reinstall the screw. That's it.
- It's inexpensive to operate: The three tiny LEDs come on only when it's dark, thanks to the light sensor built into the cover.
- It's not an ugly plug-in. It looks exactly like an ordinary cover plate. The LEDs at the bottom light up the floor right where you need it.
- The price is reasonable: You'll spend \$15 for one, but they cost less if you buy a bunch.

The Guidelight is powered by two little prongs that snap over the terminal screws on the receptacle. Brilliant! No batteries, no wiring, no nuthin! You have a choice of two outlet cover types in ivory, almond or white. Go to snappower.com to light up your night.

The foldable Cub Cadet Hauler can handle 800 lbs. of whatever you've got-mulch, soil, rocks-and unload it easily with the press of a foot pedal. You can fold one side down for easy access to a heavy bag of fertilizer or fold down all the sides and use it as a flat bed to haul logs, fence posts or lumber. There's an optional tool caddy for rakes and shovels and a handle kit to convert the trailer to a two-wheel pushcart.

The best thing about the Hauler is that it folds up small enough to be stored in your garage or shed. That's a big benefit: Most trailers stored outside die of exposure to the elements long before they would have worn out from actual use. The Cub Cadet Hauler is available wherever Cub Cadet products are sold and costs \$300 to \$400, depending on the options.



Diagonal cutters have been around for decades. Now Irwin Tools has introduced a new version called the PowerSlot (aka the VISE-GRIP Max-Leverage Pliers with PowerSlot, Diagonal Cutting, 8-inch #1902413).

Irwin engineered the mechanics so that the cutters exert twice the cutting power of conventional diagonal cutters with the same amount of hand squeeze. Couple that with super-duper hardened steel to handle all that cutting power and you have a set of diagonals worth the \$42 price tag. Read all about it and find a retailer at irwin.com. (And yes, we really did cut that chain link with them. You'd never be able to do that with everyday cutters.)



### SMALL-ENGINE STORAGE SOLUTION

My brother borrowed my chain saw and returned it with a half-full quart can of premixed gas. When he told me the gas cost \$8 for 1 gt., I told him he got ripped off. But after he left, I noticed the fuel had a 95 octane rating, contained no ethanol and had a shelf life of three years. It dawned on me that this was a perfect solution for engines I may not use very often, like my pole saw and pressure washer. Now I even run it through my lawn mower and snow blower on the last run of the season. I just make sure I hide the cans where my brother won't see them because admitting he did something clever is out of the question. This can of 50:1 fuel from Husqvarna is available at Lowe's.




### STAND-UP BAGS

Gorilla Glue engineered the bags with a square base and super-heavy-duty plastic, and if you fold a little cuff at the top and treat them gently, they do stand up. These 42-gallon bags are incredibly tough—just the thing if you have heavy-duty trashing to do. The Self-Standing Bags cost about \$13 for a dozen at Walmart.

### HALF-PENCIL MARKS EXACT COPIES






### NEW LAPTOP FOOT

# MODERN DECK BUILDING

Expert tips for great looks that will last decades

There are tons of new decking products on the market, and building methods continue to evolve and improve. To keep up with the changes, we traveled to builders' shows and deck expos to meet with tool and product manufacturers and get advice from top-notch deck builders. Here are some of the best tips and products we found.

### Smart spacing

These yellow deck board spacers can be used to space boards either 1/8 in. or 3/16 in. apart.
Our experts like large spacers like these because they're easy to grab and pull out, and less likely to fall down between the boards. They're also highly visible, which makes them less of a trip hazard. You can find the Johnson DeckMate spacers at some home centers or online for about \$5 each.

# AZEK iPAD APP

### DECISION TOOL

Besides picking the color of the decking, you'll have to decide on the color of the fascia boards, railings, spindles, hardware, posts and caps. And those aren't easy decisions, especially when all you have to go on is a brochure with tiny color swatches. AZEK has a new, free app for the iPad that can help. Check it out at azek.com or the App Store on iTunes. The app allows you to change the color and texture on several different stock deck scenes, and once you find the combination that suits you best, there's a place to keep notes so you won't forget and have to start all over.


Visualizers like this are super handy, but our experts still recommend a hands-on experience before you make your final decision. Go to the supplier and check out a sample of the actual product. Pick it up and feel the texture. If there's a display, take off your shoes and walk around on it.



### **BEST WAY TO FLASH** A LEDGER BOARD

Deck ledger boards are a common source of water infiltration, and it can be years before you discover the damage caused by water finding its way behind the ledger and into your home. The process below may seem a little excessive, but the extra time spent following these steps may save you thousands of dollars in repairs.

- 1. Install house wrap on the wall several inches higher than where the top of the ledger board will be.
- 2. Install a Z-flashing approved for pressure-treated lumber where the bottom of the ledger will be.
- 3. Cover the top of the Z-flashing with house wrap tape.
- 4. Fasten the ledger board over the Z-flashing.
- 5. Install flashing approved for pressure-treated lumber on top of the ledger.
- 6. Cover the top of the flashing with window/door flashing tape.
- 7. Install house wrap over the flashing.
- 8. Fasten the house wrap to the wall with house wrap tape.
- 9. Install the siding...finally!



### **Tougher decking**

Just a few years ago, most manufactured decking was "composite," typically a combination of wood fibers and polymers. Composite was a big improvement over wood, but today most manufacturers offer something even better: "capped" or "shelled" decking.

The core of capped decking is similar to composite or made from cellular PVC, but that core is covered with a layer of denser, tougher polymer. That means better resistance to scratches, stains and fading. Brands include AZEK, TimberTech and Trex. It costs about \$5 to 10 per sq. ft. Paying more usually gets you a thicker or tougher cap, plus deeper texturing and blended coloring for a more natural look. The decking shown above, Trex Transcend, is made from 95 percent recycled material and includes a 25-year fade and stain warranty.

### Better than lags

Structural screws work great for hanging a ledger board and fastening thick framing members. The main advantage of structural screws over traditional lag screws is that they don't need a pilot hole, which cuts the installation time in half! The Strong-Drive TIMBER Screws shown here have a low-

profile head and are driven in with a large Torx bit. An 18-volt impact driver or 1/2-in. drill should be enough to get the job done.



### Hide ugly ends


The ends of manufactured deck boards are ugly, and you don't want to leave them exposed. There are a couple ways to hide them. The easiest solution is to raise the fascia board so the top is flush with the top of the decking (Photo A). But keep in mind that most fascia/skirt boards are 11-1/4 in. wide, which means they aren't wide enough to fully cover both the deck boards and a 2x12 joist.

Another way to hide the ends is to install a border/perimeter board around the outside edges of the deck (Photo B). This method can really dress up your deck, especially if you choose an accent color for this board. The downside of a perimeter board is that it requires extra framing underneath.









### FASTENING OPTIONS

Screwing through the face of the boards is by far the fastest, easiest and most structurally sound method of fastening deck boards. Modern deck screws have reverse threads to suck the decking down tight to the joists and specially designed **PLASTIC** HIDDEN heads to prevent mushrooming. FASTENER Some face-screwing systems, like the Cortex system from FastenMaster, allow you to countersink the screws and fill the holes with plugs made out of the same material as the decking. Installing the plugs is time consuming, but the fastener locations are almost invisible.

Boards with grooves on the sides can be held down with hidden fasteners. Hidden fasteners are self-gapping and easy to install, and you

can't beat them if you want a nice, clean, fastener-free look. Each decking manufacturer has a recommended fastening system, but our experts avoid the kind that require fastening from underneath. They also prefer fasteners that don't require removing half the deck in order to replace one damaged board in the middle.





### Longer spans, fewer posts

Engineered lumber has been used inside buildings for years because it's stronger and straighter than regular lumber. And now there are versions for outdoor use. It may not be cost effective to frame an entire deck with engineered lumber, but installing an engineered-lumber drop beam is a great way to reduce the number of posts and footings needed to support a deck. The one shown here is made by Weyerhaeuser.

### AVOID ROT WITH FLASHING TAPE

Pressure-treated lumber that stays wet will eventually rot. Flashing tape keeps water from getting trapped between doubled-up joists. If you're resurfacing an existing deck frame, tape over any joists that have a lot of holes from the previous nails or screws. Buy black tape if you can find it; shiny silver and white tapes may be noticeable between the gaps in the decking. The tape shown will be covered by the perimeter deck board. A 4-in. x 50-ft. roll of flashing tape costs about \$15 at home centers.



### Stronger decking

NyloDeck is unlike most decking on the market. It's made from 100 percent recycled carpet fibers. It cuts and installs like other decking products, but it's much stiffer. Unlike most other manufactured decking, it can span joists spaced 24 in. on center and can be installed at a 45-degree angle over joists spaced 16 in. on center. That comes in handy when you're resurfacing an existing deck frame. The extra stiffness also helps constrain new treated lumber, which tends to twist and warp. NyloDeck doesn't eliminate the need for blocking between the joists, but it does help prevent a wavylooking finished product. NyloDeck sells for \$9 to \$10 per sq. ft. 



### Blocking keeps decks flat and square

Manufactured decking isn't as stiff as wood decking, so it allows joists to bow. And that leads to a wavy deck surface. To help keep joists flat, our experts always attach blocking perpendicular to the joists. They also install diagonal blocking to keep the entire frame from racking. Use narrower lumber (2x8 blocking on 2x10 joists) so the blocking looks less conspicuous from a distance. Once everything is secure, our experts run a string on the top side of the joists and plane down the remaining high spots.



### Spruce up your existing deck

New metal balusters can give your existing wood deck a sleek, modern feel. These two options are made by Deckorators. The Baroque balusters are simply screwed to rails. The round Classic balusters are held in place by hidden connectors that require no hole drilling. Deckorators balusters don't need to be painted or stained, which is probably the most tedious deck maintenance task there is. A five-pack of

the Baroque costs \$33, and a 10-pack of the Classic costs \$20 plus \$7 for 20 connectors. You can find them at Lowe's.



### NO-DIG FOOTINGS

Our experts gave up concrete deck footings a couple years ago. Instead, they've been using the Diamond Pier foundation system. To install a Diamond Pier footing, just drive in four pipes with a demo hammer. That eliminates a ton of digging and concrete work.

The standard deck model is the DP-50 and costs about \$125. Most home centers and lumberyards that carry this product will also have breaker hammers you could borrow or rent. Check out the videos at pinfoundations.com. The Diamond Pier system is relatively new, and you need to make sure it's approved in your





### Perfect screw sinker

When you're screwing decking, this Smart-Bit Deck Screw Depth Setter is a great tool to make sure all the screws are set at a consistent depth. The type of bit can be changed to match the screws, and the depth of the screws can be adjusted. It also has a freespinning collar with a rubber bumper to prevent marring. 

DuxxBak decking is a unique composite decking that doesn't allow water to pass between the deck boards, keeping the area under the deck dry. A dry space under the deck is a great place to continue your deck party during a rain shower, or to create some useful dry storage.

In order to channel the water away, the decking needs to run perpendicular to the house, so remember to install the framing joists parallel to the house.





Spend a little, get a lot. That's the idea behind ready-to-assemble (RTA) furniture. But RTA furniture isn't just inexpensive. It's also super adaptable. Because you assemble it yourself, RTA furniture invites tinkering. In fact, customizing RTA pieces is so common that it has its own name: "hacking."

We used furniture pieces from IKEA. You can also find RTA furniture at discount stores and home centers.







Mimic a mid-century modern classic by turning a simple shelving unit on its side, wrapping it with plywood inside and out, and attaching legs. Our materials cost was about \$250.

### Build it

Notice that the end panels of the original assembled Kallax shelving unit protrude beyond the sides. Remove both panels (**Step 1**) and trim off the protruding edges (**Step 2**). Then reattach both panels flush with the sides (**Step 3**). Cut hardwood plywood panels to wrap around the unit (**Step 4**). Make the top and bottom panels long enough to cover the side panels, and cut the side panels to fit tightly between the top and bottom pieces. Cut all the panels wide enough to create a 3/16-in. lip around the front of the shelving unit. Adhere iron-on edge banding to these pieces.


Fasten the panels with flat-head sheet metal screws after drilling countersink pilot holes through the unit. The unit's frames are hollow, so be careful not to punch through their thin faces when drilling the countersinks. Make sure the screw heads seat flush.

Cut plywood to cover the bottom and sides inside the unit (**Step 5**). Don't fasten these pieces with screws; instead, go for a friction fit. Apply iron-on edge banding to the exposed edges.

Remove all the plywood parts to apply finish. Finish the legs too. Reinstall the panels and inserts—tack the inserts with small nails or brads. Then attach the legs (**Step 6**).




Build a worktable with a huge surface, convenient storage and easy mobility by sandwiching three small storage units between a base with casters and a plywood top with hardwood edging. We spent about \$330 on materials for the table shown here.


### **Build** it

Cut hardwood plywood for the top and base and install hardwood edging and iron-on edge banding as shown in Step 1. Position two Kallax shelving units back to back and fasten them to the base with flat-head sheet metal screws after drilling countersink pilot holes through the Kallax frames (Step 2). The frames are hollow panels, so be careful not to punch through their thin faces when drilling the countersinks. Make sure the screw heads seat flush.

Install the third Kallax unit across the front of the base, using the same method. Then tip the assembly over onto the top and fasten it as before (Step 3). Install locking swivel casters (Step 4). Then tip the assembly right-side up and round over all the top's sharp edges with a router and a round-over bit. Complete the job by installing Kallax drawer inserts and applying your favorite finish to the top (Step 5).

Create a classic mudroom bench by fastening base molding and a new top to a cabinet designed to display a flat-screen TV. Our bench materials cost about \$250, plus \$50 for base molding. Your base molding cost will depend on the type and quantity you choose.


### **Build** it

Assemble the Hemnes TV unit through Step 27 of the manufacturer's instructions. Move it into position and shim the legs as necessary to level it. Then install a support block under the rails beneath the center divider (Step 1). This allows the unit to be used as a bench. Fasten the unit to the wall through its upper back rail (Step 2).

Build a new top by gluing hardwood edging to 3/4-in.-thick hardwood plywood and then rounding over all the sharp edges (Step 3). Sand the top, stain it and apply your favorite finish. Use corner brackets to fasten the top to the bench (Step 4). Then fasten base molding around the bench to build it in (Step 5). Install the drawers to complete the project.





Bacteria are what makes a septic system work. They break down waste, leaving water clean enough to safely percolate down into the earth. The whole system is designed to keep bacteria healthy and busy. Some live in the tank, but most do their work in the drain field.

# WHAT GOES WRONG

### Don't abuse the system

A septic system that was properly designed and installed needs only occasional "pumping" to remove the sludge and scum from the tank. But without knowing it, you can do things that harm-or destroy-the system.

Waste that decomposes slowly (or not at all) gets flushed down drains. Cigarette butts, diapers and coffee grounds often cause problems.

If used heavily, garbage disposers can send too much solid waste into the system.

Household chemicals like disinfecting cleaners and

antibacterial soaps kill bacteria. Most systems can handle light use of these products, but the less you use them, the

better.

Lint from synthetic fibers flows from washing machine. Bacteria in the tank and drain field can't break it down.

> Too much wastewater over a short period of time flushes out the tank too rapidly.

Too much sludge reduces bacteria's ability to break down waste. Excess sludge can also overflow into the drain field.

Sludge or scum plugs holes in the pipe.

Compacted soil and gravel block seepage of effluent and deprive bacteria of oxygen. This is often caused by cars driving or parking on the drain field.

Roots from trees and shrubs can clog and damage a drain field.


### Get your tank pumped...

Your tank must be pumped out regularly by a pro. Pumping removes the buildup of sludge and scum, which slows down bacterial action in the tank. Your tank may need pumping each year, but it's possible to go two or three years between pumpings, depending on the size of your tank and the amount of waste you run through the system. Ask your inspector to make a rough recommendation for how often your tank should be pumped.

### ...but don't hire a pumper until you need it Regular inspections and pumping are criti-

cal. But if you're not squeamish, you can check the sludge level yourself with a device called The Sludge Judge. It costs \$100 to \$125 and is widely available online. Once you've determined that your tank is one-third full of sludge, call a contractor to come pump it out.





### SEPTIC SOLUTIONS

### Get an inspection

A thorough initial inspection by a pro will cost \$300 to \$500; after that, regular inspections cost less than \$100 each. Your pro will be able to tell you how often your system should be inspected.

Simple as a septic system may seem, evaluating its health really requires an expert. There are plenty of contractors who will gladly pump the sludge out of your tank, but in my experience many don't fully understand how a septic system works or how it should be maintained. I highly recommend looking for a contractor who has received some formal training in the science of septic systems. Some states have adopted certification programs for septic contractors-check with your Secretary of State's office to see if yours is among them.

A complete inspection will determine whether your system is up to code (many are not) and the condition of the tank and drain field. A good inspector will also be able to tell you whether your tank is large enough for your household, and the maximum volume of water you can pass through it in a day.

You may be able to improve the performance of your system by adding bacteria with a product such as RID-X. Your pro should be able to tell you if your system will benefit from this treatment.

### Alternatives to a new drain field

If an inspection or sewage backup reveals that your drain field is in trouble, the ultimate solution is to replace it. The cost can be huge, however, so it's worth discussing other options with a contractor.

- Clean the pipes. A contractor can clear out the drain field pipes with a rotary pressure washer. "Jetting" the pipes usually costs about \$200.
- Treat the system with chemicals. Ask your contractor about treating your system with a commercial product (not a homemade one) that increases the amount of oxygen in the drain field. I recommend Septic-Scrub (arcan.com). A typical treatment costs \$500 to \$1,000.
- Loosen the soil. In states where it's legal, some contractors can fracture compacted soil around the pipes by injecting high-pressure air in numerous locations around the drain field, a process called "terra-lifting." Depending on the situation, this can cost less than \$1,000 or more than \$4,000.

### Protect your drain field from lint

Install a filter on your washing machine's drain. This device prevents lint from entering the system, particularly the synthetic fibers that bacteria can't digest. I've developed one of these filters myself and named it the Septic Protector (septicprotector.com). It costs about \$150, plus shipping, and includes a replacement filter.

### Don't overload the system

Limit your water use. Reducing the amount of water that runs into your tank, particularly over a short period of time, will prevent the flushing of untreated waste into your drain field. You can replace old toilets with low-flow models, install reduced-flow showerheads, and simplest of all, wash laundry throughout the week rather than just on Saturday morning.

We test 13 gas and electric models

"I borrowed my buddy's pressure washer, discovered I couldn't live without one and bought my own the very next day." After hearing a hundred stories like that, we decided it was time for a tool test. So we picked eight gas-powered units priced from \$320 to \$430 and five electric models priced up to \$270. You can buy pressure washers for much less, but the service pros tell us those units break down often and usually can't be repaired. We limited our choices to major brands sold at home centers and online.

#### Two critical ratings

Pressure washers carry two ratings that reflect their cleaning power: pressure, measured in pounds per square inch (psi), and water flow rate, which is measured in gallons per minute (gpm). A machine with lower ratings can do almost all the jobs a more powerful machine can do. But a machine with higher ratings will clean much, much faster.

#### Pressure matters, but...

Higher pressure cleans faster, but don't allow small differences in psi to drive your decision. You probably won't notice much difference between 2,800 and 3,000 psi, for example. The gas models we tested range from 2,500 psi to 3,100 psi; the electrics from 1,700 to 1,800 psi.

#### Gas vs. electric

Gas models have one huge advantage: They clean faster, due to much higher pressure and flow rates. They can handle any job a homeowner can throw at them, including heavy concrete cleaning.

Electric models have all the other advantages. They're much smaller and half the weight of a gas machine. They start up as soon as you squeeze the trigger and shut down as soon as you let go. So you won't have any gas hassles or starting issues, and you'll never have to worry about pump damage from extended idling. And since there's no exhaust, you can use them indoors.

If you need maximum power and want to get the job done fast, go with gas. Otherwise, enjoy the convenience of an electric pressure washer.

#### What they can and can't do

Pressure washers are great for removing deepseated dirt, grease, peeling paint and even graffiti from concrete, asphalt, siding, decks, lawn furniture, garbage cans, boats and trailers, and outdoor power equipment. Electric models can remove light stains and dirt from concrete but may not have enough oomph for the heavy stains.

With accessories, you can turn your gas-powered pressure washer into a wet sandblaster or use it to power a water broom or a mechanical sweeper. Add a telescoping extension wand and gutter cleaner (such as the General Pump Giraffe 24-ft. wand, \$190, and gutter cleaner, \$15, both from pressurewashersdirect.com) and you can clean your second-story siding and gutters without climbing a ladder.

But pressure washers are also very good at destroying items around your home. The high pressure can break windows, gouge wood siding and decking, and force water behind siding and flashing, causing extensive damage. They work great for blasting mud off your car or truck but leave a fine film of dirt behind. A regular garden hose and wash mitt actually work better for normal car washing.

#### THE DIFFERENCES ARE IN THE DETAILS



A pressure washer has a simple mission: to blast out water at super-high pressure. All of the machines we tested did that without trouble and performed as promised. So aside from pressure and flow rates, we found that features made the real differences between models. Some models were just plain more convenient to use than others. Here's what we learned:



Dial nozzles are great Pressure washer nozzles come in two varieties: individual snap-in quickchange nozzles and a dial-type multi-spray pattern nozzle. We found no difference in performance. But for convenience, the dial nozzle wins the contest hands down.

The number of nozzles included with the machine varied by manufacturer. The Powerhorse unit came with just two nozzles, one for soap and one for spray. Other machines had three, four or five nozzles. Additional nozzles cost about \$8 each and are available at most home centers.


All the gas machines we chose used a standard nozzle coupling. If the gas machine you like comes with individual nozzles, you can convert it to a dial style for about \$25. However, some electric units use a proprietary hose, gun and nozzle fitting, making it much more difficult to find additional or replacement accessories and parts.

#### Variable pressure vs. fixed

Most pressure washers run at maximum pressure all the time, but some let you turn down the pressure for delicate surfaces. This is a nice feature, but you can get the same effect just by using a wider spray pattern and holding the nozzle farther away from the surface. Or buy an add-on pressure regulator like the Simpson Dial-N-Wash (\$35 at home centers).



#### Higher hose connections are easier

The pumps and hose connections on vertical-shaft gasoline engines are mounted at the bottom of the unit, near the ground. The pumps on horizontal-shaft engines sit about 8 in. higher. The designs work equally well. It's just a matter of convenience when attaching the garden and highpressure hoses. If you have bum knees or trouble bending over, that slight height advantage makes it easier to connect hoses.



The machines with pneumatic tires were the easiest to move around, especially on steps and gravel. But they need occasional reinflation. Plastic or molded rubber wheels get stuck much more readily.



#### Soap tanks are more work

Pressure washers provide the best results when you pretreat with pressure washer soap. Some machines include an onboard soap tank. We initially thought that was a great idea. But we found it to be a nuisance overall. We had to constantly refill the tank on large jobs. And afterward, the tank needed to be cleaned out (dried soap can damage the pump).

Instead, we prefer the siphon tube approach. Just shove the end of the tube into a gallon of cleaner and start soaping. When you're done, rinse the siphon tube, cap the jug and call it done. You can convert a machine with an onboard tank by disconnecting the tank tube and installing a siphon tube/filter accessory (less than \$10 at home centers) to the soap port on the pump.

#### TWO UNIQUE FEATURES

#### Craftsman Grip & GO

The pumps on gas-powered pressure washers can overheat and self-destruct (a \$200 repair) if you let them idle for more than a few minutes. The Craftsman No. 020573 Grip & GO pressure washer's electric start feature fires up the unit when you squeeze the trigger and shuts it down when you let go. That means you don't have to manually stop and start the machine every time you want to move it. And the electric start is easier for those who have trouble using a rope pull.

#### Briggs & Stratton POWERflow+

Most gas-powered pressure washers top out at 2.7 gallons per minute (gpm), and the electrics max out at 1.4 gpm. But the Briggs & Stratton POWERflow+ machines can pump a lot more water (5 gpm for the gas version and 4 gpm for the electric). That extra flow is just what you need to quickly rinse soap and debris off a driveway or your siding. Just turn the dial nozzle to the POWERflow+ setting and the machine will automatically jump to the higher flow rate.

We liked the portability of this unit so much that we had to create a special award. It's not only small and easy to store but is less than half the weight of most electrics. Karcher had portability in mind when it designed this machine. Instead of being mounted on a cart, the unit has four wheels, so it follows you around as you wash (you have to uncoil the garden hose so it doesn't kink). Or just pick it up and carry it with you—it weighs only 15 lbs.



## PRO tips

#### HAUL THE SCAFFOLD SAFELY

Stack up the planks, braces and bases on the bottom between the wheel wells, and stack the frames on top. Avoid propping the frames up on the side of the bed. It's best to have everything as low as possible so parts don't get blown or bounced out. And frames that stick out past the side of the bed can be a conk hazard for someone walking by the truck. If you have a shorter bed, you may have to keep the tailgate open; just make sure to secure it all with a tie-down strap.



#### Plank the whole bay

Whenever possible, cover the whole width of the scaffold with planks. This creates a larger work area and reduces the risk of a fall. When it isn't possible, especially when you're working midway up ladder frames like these, install another plank higher up to create a sort of guardrail. See "Build a Handy Workbench" on p. 57. When you work on casters, install a diagonal "gooser" brace. It will keep the scaffold square and stable.





#### SAFE SOLO SETUP

Install the base jacks or casters first so you don't have to lift the entire scaffold to slide them in. Install both cross braces on one frame. It will stay upright with the support of the cross braces (Photo A). Move the second frame into position and attach the cross braces to that (Photo B). Slide the scaffold about 14 in. from the wall before installing the planks.



#### MEET THE EXPERT

Joel Almquist started out working on scaffolds as a commercial mason. Every morning his boss would say, "Let's make sure everybody goes home tonight." Joel always took safety seriously and now works at Scaffold Service Inc. in St. Paul, MN, where he teaches scaffold safety to pros in the trades.



#### INSTALL A GUARDRAIL

Installing a guardrail is the best way to prevent accidentally stepping off the edge of the platform. Safety harnesses aren't necessary when you're working on this type of scaffold. In fact, if you fall while wearing a safety harness, you could pull the whole platform down with you, endangering everyone working in the area.



#### Build a stable base

Scaffold frames are designed for use with either casters or base plates. If you skip them, the frame tubes can get damaged and structurally weakened. Set a 2x10 block of wood under each leg, even when using a base plate. This will help prevent sinking into soft soils or hot asphalt.


Setting the scaffold on blocks when working on concrete isn't necessary, but it's still a good idea. An uneven floor or a slightly cupped base plate could result in a small mating surface. The slight flex in wood ensures a nice, even distribution of weight. When you're working on an uneven surface, level and plumb the scaffold with an adjustable base jack. Never set the scaffold on masonry or stacks of wood.





#### **MAINTAIN A** THREE-POINT GRIP

When you're climbing a scaffold, always maintain a three-point grip. That means that one hand and two feet, or one foot and two hands, should stay in contact with the scaffold at all times. Keep your body as close to the frame as possible. Leaning way out could cause the whole works to tip over right on top of you. And never climb on the cross braces; they're not designed to handle the weight.



#### Keep stuff from falling

Keep the planks clear of clutter to reduce the risk of tripping or kicking stuff onto unsuspecting souls working below. Keep your tools and supplies in buckets, caddies and toolboxes whenever possible. Install a 2x4 toe board to prevent items from falling. Hold it in place at the corners with wire. It's tempting to hang tools from the railings, but don't do it. Adding weight to the railings increases the odds that they could fail if someone leans against them. Hard hats for ground workers are always a good idea.



## Access the platform with a ladder

Use a ladder to safely and easily access a scaffold, especially when you're working with wood planks hanging over the ends. Run the ladder at least 3 ft. past the surface of the planks. Lean the ladder on the wall rather than the scaffold itself or you could tip it over when climbing up.



#### WORKING WITH WOOD PLANKS

It's perfectly acceptable to work on wooden planks, but there are a few things you should know. Use at least 2x10 planks made from a sturdy wood like Douglas fir. Some softer pine boards won't hold up. Especially avoid boards with large knots.

Laminated veneer lumber (LVL) is ideal. Planks obtained from a rental center should have a stamp on the edge indicating they're safe to use. Wood planks should hang over the edge of the frame a minimum of 6 in., but don't have them overhang by more than 18 in. or they could tip if you step too close to the edge. Install a cleat to hold the planks in place.



#### Rent or buy?

If you only need to use a scaffold for a weekend, then renting is probably your best option. If you have a three-month-long project, you may want to consider buying your own scaffold. That way you'll have it for the next job. Consider storage before you buy; frames and planks take up a lot of wall space. Another option is to buy and then sell when you're done. If you enjoy wheeling and dealing, the cheapest option is to buy used and then sell it off again.

You can buy a 5 x 7-ft. frame and brace scaffold with adjustable base jacks, three planks and guardrails for \$400 to \$500 new or \$200 to \$300 used, depending on the quality. The same setup will cost about \$50 to rent for a day and \$95 to rent for a week. So do some math to help you decide.



#### BUILD A HANDY WORKBENCH

One way to organize your workspace is to create a workbench by installing planks at a higher level than the ones being walked on. A workbench adds a level of safety as well because you'll be less likely to trip on supplies and tools.



#### Don't mix and match

Combining scaffold styles can result in an unstable and dangerous platform. Just because most scaffold frames are yellow doesn't mean they're the same. There are at least five different styles of scaffold, and many have no identifying marks. The same manufacturer often builds several different styles.

To add to the confusion. the differences in tube diameters and cross brace stud locations can be small enough that the pieces "kind of" fit together. The only way to really be sure is to measure the overall frame dimensions, the inside and outside tube diameters, and the cross brace stud spacing.







#### Stay clear of power lines

You don't have to touch a power line to get electrocuted. Electricity can arc from the line to conductive materials (like scaffolds). Keep a minimum distance of 10 ft. from all power lines.

### Top Ten TIPS

Studies show that the average six-room home in the United States collects 40 lbs. of dust each year. Sounds impressively awful, right? But don't confuse all that dust with dirt and bad house-keeping. It's actually a combination of dead skin, animal fur, dander, decomposing insects, dust mites, food debris, lint, fabric fibers, drywall particles, tracked-in soil, soot and pollen. It also contains hazardous chemicals that migrate from home products and enter through open doors, windows and on the soles of your shoes. Household dust can trigger allergy and asthma symptoms. While it's impossible to get rid of dust completely, here are our top tips for keeping dust at a minimum so you and your family stay healthier.

Clean with microfiber products Microfiber products attract and hold dust with an electrostatic charge, unlike dry rags and feather dusters, which just spread dust around. Machine washable microfiber products can save you money over disposable brands because you can use them over and over. Just make sure to let them air dry (so they'll stay soft), and don't use bleach or fabric softener, which degrades the fibers and reduces their ability to attract and hold dust.

Microfiber dusting tools for blinds, ceiling fans, floors and general cleaning are available online and at many stores. Buy your microfiber cloths in the automo-

tive section. "Cleaning" and "detailing" towels are the same as "dusting" cloths, and they're often a lot cheaper.





Bag and box it Stray fibers from clothes, bedding and pillows are a major source of dust. The solution is to store these things in bags and clear plastic containers. You can use spacesaving vacuum-seal bags, garment bags or even large garbage bags to help cut down on dust from clothes and fabrics. Clear plastic containers will lock fibers in and dust out and let you see what's inside. And because seasonal clothes shed fibers year-round, store your winter coats inside garment bags to help contain fibers and keep the coats themselves from becoming coated with dust.

Upgrade your furnace filter Your home's forced-air heating or cooling system helps to control dust by filtering the air. A standard cheap fiberglass filter protects your furnace from large dust particles and provides maximum airflow, but it does little to reduce household dust. More expensive pleated filters usually provide a good balance between cost and filtration efficiency. These filters

But if you have family members with allergies, consider spending more on high-efficiency filters, which capture 99 percent of airborne particles as small as 0.3 microns (bacteria and viruses, fumes and pollen). Be aware that you'll have to run your furnace fan full time to get the maximum benefit from a high-efficiency filter, and you'll have to change the filter frequently to prevent damage to your furnace from the reduced airflow.

trap 80 to 95 percent of particles 5 microns and larger.

If you go the high-efficiency route, install a filter monitor such as FilterScan (\$100), which automatically alerts you when your furnace filter needs changing, or the GeneralAire G99 Filter Gage (\$17), which requires you to manually check it. #### Make the most of your vacuuming

The right vacuuming technique, combined with the right filters, bags and machine, has a significant impact on how much dust remains in both your carpeting and your house. Keep the following tips in mind:

- Vacuum entrance areas and high-traffic areas twice a week and the rest of the carpeting and large area rugs at least weekly.
- Make numerous slow passes over the same area in all directions (fast passes stir up more dust than is being sucked up).
- Take smaller rugs outside for a vigorous shaking every week and take large area rugs outside several times a year and beat them with a broom or tennis racket.
- Use certified True High-Efficiency Particulate Air (HEPA) filters to remove invisible particles and allergens. Look for the word "True" on the label; otherwise you're wasting your money.
- If you have allergies, upgrade to a sealed-body bagged vacuum with an airtight "sealed filtration" system that works together with a True HEPA filter. This means all of the exhaust will exit through the HEPA filter instead of leaking dust back into your house through the machine's housing. Sealed-body vacuums have rubber seals or gaskets around the lid and filter and will last 10 to 20 years. Brands include Riccar, Miele and Sanitaire. You can get a good bagged vacuum for \$350 to \$600.
- Buy high-quality vacuum bags. Inexpensive 2- or 3-ply paper bags leak more dust. Higher-quality cotton-lined paper bags are better, and top-quality synthetic cotton HEPA bags are the best. Bag capacity matters too. Higher-capacity bags capture more, smaller particles that would have otherwise clogged the filter.
- Clean all your bagless vacuum filters regularly and replace them every three months.
- Turn off the agitator brush on hard flooring so you're not blowing dust into the air.
- Maintain your vacuum: Empty the canister frequently (always outside) and change bags and belts when needed. Keep the agitator brush free of hair and other material, and check the vacuum for cracks and loose hinges and get it serviced every so often to keep it running smoothly.





Dust with your dryer Blankets, pillows, slipcovers, drapes and other textiles not only trap household dust, but they create it as they shed and disintegrate. Curtains and drapes in particular get very dusty because they absorb moisture and dirt from the outside and act as a landing pad for dust from ceiling fans and air vents. The best idea is to buy machine-washable items and launder them twice a year (OK, at least once). For non-machine-washable textiles, throw them in the dryer on the air-fluff setting (no heat) for 20 minutes with a damp towel. The damp towel will attract pet hair, and the tumbling movement and airflow will remove the smaller particles for you.



Purify the air

Here are four things you can do to cleanse the dusty air in your home:

- Place air purifiers in your most-used rooms to help suck up dust before it settles. Choose units with True HEPA filters (\$80 to \$200 or more) rather than ionic cleaners, which release ozone, a respiratory irritant. Check out air purifier reviews at <u>cadr.org</u>.
- Add a plant to every room. Plants naturally absorb common indoor pollutants like benzene and formaldehyde. NASA studies have shown that many plants, including aloes, palms and ferns, can absorb as much as 80 percent of the formal-dehyde in a room in 24 hours.
- Keep the humidity in your house between 40 and 50 percent to help lower static electricity, which can cause dust to stick to surfaces and make them harder to clean. A humidifier (cleaned regularly) and leafy indoor plants will both increase humidity levels. Just don't increase the level to more than 50 percent. This will promote the growth of mold, a far more dangerous condition than dust. You can monitor humidity levels with a cheap hydrometer from a gardening store.
- Keep your windows closed on windy days. Dust enters through doors and windows in the form of pollen, mold spores and airborne pollutants.

Ditch your carpeting
In most homes, carpet is by far the bi

In most homes, carpet is by far the biggest dust reservoir. It's a huge source of fibers and absorbs dust like a giant sponge. Even the padding underneath holds dust, which goes airborne with each footstep. Although ripping out your wall-to-wall carpet may sound radical, it's the best thing you can do if you suffer from serious allergies. Replace carpeting with hard flooring like laminate, wood or tile, and wet mop it regularly (with a microfiber cloth) instead of sweeping. Sweeping is more likely to stir up dust than to remove it.





#### Ban shoes inside (but offer slippers)

More than half of household dust enters your home through windows, doors, vents and on the soles of your shoes. Think about where you walk all day long (restrooms, city streets, construction sites, etc.) and all the bacteria and debris your shoes collect. Do you really want to track that inside? An EPA study of homes where a doormat was added at the entrance and shoes were banned indoors showed a 60 percent reduction of lead dust and other contaminants in the home, as well as a significant reduction of allergens and bacteria.

Your first line of defense should be a coarse-fiber heavy-duty doormat placed outside exterior doors. Inside, have everyone remove shoes at the door. Keep a bench, a shoe rack and a basket of cheap slippers available so no one has to walk around in their stocking feet on chilly floors.

Clean the air while vou clean the house


Your vacuum's agitator brush and exhaust whip up dust that eventually settles on the surfaces you've just cleaned. Filter out some of that dust before it settles by switching your thermostat to "fan on." This turns on the blower inside your furnace and filters the air even while the system isn't heating or cooling. Leave the blower on for about 15 minutes after you're done cleaning. But don't forget to switch it back to "auto." Most blowers aren't designed to run constantly.





Reduce remodeling dust Remodeling dust goes everywhere air flows, so the key to stopping this dust is stopping airflow. Create an airtight plastic dust barrier curtain and completely seal the top and sides with tape. If you can't seal the bottom edge with tape, lay a board across it. Light plastic (1 mil or so) is fine for most jobs. If you need to pass through the dust barrier, use heavier 4- or 6-mil plastic and add an adhesive-backed zipper.

Also make sure to seal both supply and return air ducts with tape and plastic. That way you'll avoid plugging your furnace filter or coating every room in the house with a blanket of fine dust when the blower turns on. Note: Turn off the heating/cooling system while the ducts are covered. Operating the system with restricted airflow can damage it.





### **DIY Quiz Answers**

- **1. False.** It's easier to assemble a wall with the crowns up. That way, both ends of the stude sit solidly on the ground when you attach the top and bottom plates, instead of acting like rockers on a rocking chair.
- **2.** (A) According to the EPA, "Toilets are by far the main source of water use in the home, accounting for nearly 30 percent of residential indoor water consumption. Toilets also happen to be a major source of wasted water due to leaks and inefficiency." Upgrading your toilet to a modern, more efficient model is a great way to conserve water.



However, if you replace your anode rod before it fails—about every five years—you can double the life of your water heater.

## Surviving a flat tire

Your car or truck owner's manual shows you how to change a flat tire, assuming a best-case scenario. But the real world includes all kinds of surprises: lug nuts that won't budge, a wheel that's rusted to the hub or a spare tire that's so underinflated,

it's useless. In other words, even if you know how to change a flat tire, chances are pretty good you'll run into problems you're not prepared for. Don't think you're out of the woods just because you have roadside assistance. Because if you

get a flat tire in an area with no cell phone coverage, or the service is so backed up that it'll be hours before they get to you, you just might have to change your tire yourself.

To help you survive a flattire ordeal, we've collected these tips. Some we've taken from our own ugly encounters, and others we've learned from our readers.

So slow down! The spare-tire manufacturers are serious about their 50-mph maximum speed limit. Get your flat tire repaired or replaced right away because space-saver spares are designed to run for only 50 to 70 miles.



#### Don't break your plastic wheel covers

Carmakers use two methods to secure plastic wheel covers: spring clips and screw-on plastic lug nuts. If you don't know which type is on your vehicle, try turning one of the plastic nuts with the socket end of your tire iron. If it rotates, you have the screw-on type. Unscrew all the plastic nuts and lift off the cover.

If the nut doesn't turn, you have the snap-on style. Those have to be pried off, and that's where some people get into trouble. If you jam the tapered end of your tire


socket is?

wheel that requires a special "keyed socket" to loosen it. If you can't locate the key when you have a flat tire (or another driver in the family isn't aware of it), it won't be possible to remove the wheel. You'll have to use Fix-A-Flat (see p. 73), call for roadside service or have the vehicle towed to a shop. That can cost upward of \$200. So make a point of keeping the key in a safe place, like the glove box, that is known to everyone who drives the car.



#### Pack a tire inflator

If you don't routinely top off the air pressure in your spare tire, don't be surprised if it's severely underinflated when you need it. Driving on a severely underinflated full-size spare is unsafe, and driving on an underinflated space-saver spare is downright dangerous. Solve that problem by keeping a plug-in tire inflator in your vehicle at all times (one choice is the Slime 12-Volt Digital Tire Inflator, No. 40022; \$30 at auto parts stores). Start the engine, plug the unit into your power port and bring the spare tire up to the recommended pressure (found on the decal inside the driver's door area) before installing it on the hub.



#### Removing a stuck wheel

If you don't rotate your tires every 5,000 miles, your wheels may be bonded to the hub by rust. Here's a way to knock the wheels loose, submitted by one of our readers.

With the lug nuts loosened about three-quarters of the way, grab the spare by the center hole and use it as a battering ram. Swing it horizontally with all your might so it strikes the stuck wheel at the 12 o'clock position. Repeat the blows at the 3 o'clock and 9 o'clock positions until the wheel breaks free from the hub.



#### Fix-A-Flat can get you out of a jam!

If you're not confident that you or the driver can change a flat tire, buy two cans of aerosol tire sealer from any auto parts store (Fix-A-Flat is one well-known brand) and keep them in the vehicle. The cans are sold in several sizes for compact, standard and truck-size tires. Tire sealants work on tread punctures 3/16 in. or less in diameter. They won't work on sidewall punctures, blowouts or any other catastrophic failures. You've got little to lose by trying sealant.

You can greatly increase your chances of a successful seal if you can find the puncture site and move the vehicle until the leak is facing down. If you see the culprit, don't remove it; it'll help seal the hole. If the can is frozen, thaw it with the defroster or floor heater vents until the contents move freely when shaken. Then fill the tire following the directions on the can. If the rim doesn't lift off the ground after using a second can, the puncture is too large to be sealed and you'll have to call for help.

Top off the air pressure as soon as possible. If you have a tire inflator on hand, do it now. This is a very temporary fix, so get the tire repaired professionally ASAP. Tire sealant must be removed within three days or 100 miles, whichever comes first. Inform the tire shop that you've used tire sealant so no one breathes in the propellants (not flammable, but not healthy either). The shop may charge extra for cleaning the sealant from the tire.

#### WHAT'S THE DEAL WITH TIRE PLUGS?

Many DIYers think they can permanently repair tire punctures with just a plug. They're wrong. A tire plug is just half of the repair. The tire's interior liner must also be repaired with a patch, and that means a trip to the tire store. Skip the patch and you risk a catastrophic blowout.

#### Assemble a mission-critical kit

Whether you change your tire yourself or rely on a tire sealant, keep these "mission-critical" items in your vehicle at all times.



Wheel chocks. Keep your car from falling off the jack, especially on slopes.

Gloves. Good to have all year long, but critical for handling cold metal in subzero temps.

Tire inflator. You'll need this to fill low spares and top off tires repaired with Fix-A-Flat.



#### Spare your limbs when installing the spare

Truck and SUV tires are really heavy. Some DIYers sit on the ground with their knees under the wheel so their legs can help with the lifting. That's a great way to lose a limb or two if the vehicle falls off the jack (which happens more often than you think). Instead, raise the vehicle just enough to get a 1-in. clearance between the tire and the ground.

Rotate the hub until one of the studs is in the 12 o'clock position. Roll the spare tire next to the vehicle and position it so the holes line up with the studs. Then grab the wheel by the rim, lift it up and hang the tire on the top stud. Then align the rest of the holes with the studs and push it on.



#### Save your back when loosening lug nuts

There's no way you can loosen the lug nuts once you raise the vehicle—the tire will just spin. Instead, break loose-but don't remove-the lug nuts while the tire is still on the ground. To save your back, place the tire iron on each lug nut so the handle is in the 9 o'clock position. Place both hands on the tire iron and push down with all your might. If that doesn't work, use a downward bouncing motion with your weight to break the nut loose.

## **HOME CARE** + repair

Over time, every asphalt driveway develops cracks. They're more than just an eyesore; they actually speed up the demise of your driveway if you ignore them. And in cold climates, water seeps in and destroys the asphalt when it expands during freezing. If you plan to topcoat your driveway (which we'll cover in an upcoming issue), you'll need to fix the cracks first.

You can buy squeeze bottle and caulk tube-style crack filler products from any home center. They're quick and easy to apply, but they shrink and crack and don't last very long. However, there's another way to fill asphalt cracks: with melt-in filler that doesn't shrink-the same type used by highway crews. The melt-in material and trowelable cover mix cost about \$100 for a typical driveway.


It'll take almost a full day to repair several cracks if they're 20 ft. long or so, but the repairs will last much longer than other quick fixes. In addition to the melt-in and trowel mix products, you'll need a propane torch with an extension hose, and a leaf blower or compressed air gun. Use an angle grinder fitted with a diamond wheel to widen hairline cracks and to quickly remove previously applied crack fillers.

#### Buy the supplies and tools

We used melt-in 1/2-in.-diameter Latex-ite Pli-Stix Crack and Joint Filler and Latex-ite Trowel Patch for this project. Our driveway had several 25-ft.long cracks. So we bought four 30-ft. packages of the crack filler (\$15 each) and four 2-gallon pails of the trowel patch (\$17 each). We already had a propane torch. But we bought an extension hose to eliminate the flame-outs that occur when you tip a propane cylinder upside down (WH0159 Bernzomatic Universal Torch Extension Hose, 5 ft., \$15).

#### Check the weather and prep the cracks

Choose a sunny day with no rain in the



forecast for at least 24 hours. Start by rolling the crack filler rope onto a sunny section of the driveway so it warms and softens. While it's warming, remove all the dirt, weeds and old crack filler from the cracks. Scrape out the old material with a flat-blade screwdriver or 5-in-1 paint tool. It's a painstaking process, but it's critical to getting a successful repair. So don't skip it or take shortcuts. Cleaning and filling hairline cracks are more time consuming, and the fix won't last. unless you widen them with an angle grinder and diamond wheel (Photo 1).

Once you finish digging out all the cracks, blow the dust and debris out of the cracks and off the driveway using a leaf blower or compressed air gun.

#### Add the filler and melt it

Push the melt-in filler deep into the cracks (Photo 2). If any filler bulges above the surface of the driveway, cut off the excess with a knife or compress it so it sits below the surface (Photo 3).

Then screw the extension hose onto your propane tank and mount the torch to the other end and fire it up. The melt-in filler burns easily, so don't





#### PATCH PITTED ASPHALT

Asphalt driveways can develop pitted areas from motor oil and coolant contamination and repeated freeze/thaw cycles. If the pits are 1/2 in. or less, you can fill them with a spreadable filler product. (Latex-ite Trowel Patch, \$17, is one choice available at home centers.)

Clean oil stains and prime with oil stain primer. Then coat the entire pitted area with patch material and let dry overnight (**Photo 1**). Apply a second coat to top off any partially filled pits (**Photo 2**) and smooth the surface. Let dry.



**1 FILL THE PITS**Force the filler material into the cracks and pits with a trowel. Then smooth the streaks with an old broom.



**ENLARGE THE AREA AND SMOOTH**Pour more filler material onto the pitted area and spread it with a floor squeegee to smooth the surface.

#### Recharge a reverse osmosis holding tank

If your reverse osmosis filtration system doesn't deliver as much water as it did when it was new and you've changed the filters and membrane, the problem may be an undercharged or leaking holding tank. The tank uses a traditional tire valve-style stem that can lose air over time. When the air pressure drops, the bladder can't push out as much water.

Here's how to check the pressure. First, you'll need a low-pressure tire gauge (one choice is the Victor Tire Gauge Low Pressure 1 to 20 psi; \$6 at amazon.com). You can't use an ordinary tire gauge. Next, turn off the water supply valve to the filter system and shut off the valve at the top of the holding tank. Disconnect the tubing at the tank valve. Dump all the water out of the tank. Then check the air pressure as shown below. Adjust to the recommended pressure. Then reinstall the tank and tubing and turn on the water.

Once the tank is filled, note the filled pressure. Wait a few days and check the pressure again. If the pressure is the same, you're done. If the tank has lost pressure, try replacing the valve core (available at auto parts stores). If the new core doesn't solve the problem, replace the tank.



#### **CHECK THE TANK'S EMPTY PRESSURE**

Unscrew the protective cap and check the tank pressure. Inflate or deflate with a tire pump to achieve the manufacturer's recommended pressure (usually 5 to 7 psi).




