Now Weber has introduced its Genesis II line, with prices ranging from \$700 to \$2,000. The Genesis II LX E-640, shown above, is the top of the line. 

The app on my phone lets me open the lock remotely (within Bluetooth range). I can also use the app to set combinations that my coworkers can use. If I give out individual codes, I can track who opened it and when—not that I don't trust my coworkers. I can give out single-use codes as well. I bought the heavy-duty outdoor model No. 4401DLH for less than \$70 online.

# An easy-to-load string trimmer—really!

've had a love/hate relationship with all three string trimmers I've owned. Every single one was a pain when it came to loading the string—and every one supposedly had an "easy-load" head. Ryobi's new Reel Easy Bump Feed Head is the first one I've come across that can honestly include "Easy" in the name.

Here's how it works: Push the line through one hole until it comes out a hole on the other side, pull the line so there's an even amount on each side (up to 16 ft. total), and attach the Speed Winder crank. Turning the crank will spool the line into the head. Brilliant! The Reel Easy with Speed Winder also fits Homelite and Toro trimmers. It sells for about \$25 at The Home Depot.






# STOP ROOF LEAKS

used to own a small construction company that specialized in roofing, siding and gutter work. Faulty pipe flashing was a common cause of the roof leaks we repaired. The rubber boot on pipe flashing can dry out and crack (sometimes in just a few years), giving water a clear path into the house. Sealing the crack was a temporary solution. More often than not, we replaced the pipe flashing, which was a dicey operation when working with older, brittle shingles.

The Perma-Boot is a permanent solution that doesn't involve the hassle of ripping up shingles. Just slide the boot over the existing pipe, add adhesive and pop on the cap. I wish these guys had been around when I was still crawling around on rooftops. Perma-Boots are available in several sizes and colors. Find them for less than \$20 online and at home centers and hardware stores.

# Citrus-rind seed starters


Grapefruit, orange and other citrus rinds are just the right size for starting new seedlings. I make a hole in the bottom of each one for drainage and add some damp seed-starting mix and seeds. Then, when it's time to move them outside, I plant the whole works in the ground–peels and all. The citrus rinds make the soil more acidic, however, so I only do this with acid-loving plants like radishes, peppers and the like. – JUDY WILDER

# **HANDY HINTS®**








A polarized plug has a larger prong on the neutral leg, so it has to be put into an outlet a certain way. As I get older, I find it harder to see whether I'm holding a polarized plug right side up when I'm pushing it in. And it's especially hard to see what I'm doing when there's furniture in the way. That's why I make a dot on the tops of all my plugs. I use a black marker for light-colored plugs and white correction fluid for dark-colored ones. – **NORMAN SCHOCK** 

When you're painting or varnishing small projects, it's best to elevate them for good coverage and to keep your project from sticking to the worktable. I use an old piece of pegboard and some golf tees. The pegboard keeps the tees in place, and I can arrange them as necessary for different size projects. – **TERRY MEINCKE** 



No sooner did I finish digging footing holes for a new shed than it rained, filling all the holes with water. It looked like mud soup! I had to get rid of it quickly in order to pour concrete, so I fashioned a "mud ladle" out of a section of round ductwork, a piece of 3/4-in. plywood and a solid wood handle. Thanks to my invention, I was able to scoop out all the water in just a few minutes. – **DAVE CHOUDEK** 



Sometimes the grab bars in my shower can get a little slippery. My quick fix was to wrap them with Stretch & Seal silicone tape. It grips well and stays where you put it. # 12 Tips for Spray-Painting

The telltale signs of a bad spraypaint job are easy to spot. Stripes of uneven coverage, paint buildup in the corners, a stray hair in the finish -the list goes on. Worst of all is the dreaded run, an obvious sign that the painter applied too heavy a coat.

Here are a dozen tips to help you get a smooth, consistent finish on your next painting project. For more on this topic, including how to build a spray-paint booth, search for "spray painting" at familyhandyman.com.

# Spray-can

Ever wonder what gives spray cans their rattle? It's a glass marble most likely made by Marble King, a company in West Virginia. Marble King makes spray-can marbles and most of the marbles sold in the U.S.A., 1 million a day, 365 days a year.





# 1 DISASSEMBLE IF YOU CAN

Before you start painting, examine your project. If you can take it apart without too much trouble, do it! You'll have much better luck getting even coverage, seeing what you're doing and avoiding runs. But don't just dismantle the piece willy-nilly. Mark the parts for easy reassembly.



# 3. ALWAYS CLEAN OUT THE NOZZLE


Even though nozzle-cleaning directions are on every single can of spray paint, it's an easy step to skip. After use, hold the can upside down and press the nozzle until no more pigment shows in the spray, and then wipe the tip with a rag or paper towel. If you skip this step, you could end up with a nozzle completely clogged with dried paint or a partial clog that'll affect the spray pattern next time.



# DUST: PUBLIC ENEMY NO. 1

For a flawless finish on small parts, paint them inside a card-board box. If you have larger projects, create a poly booth. In basements, dust will shake down from the floor joists, especially if someone is stomping around upstairs, so staple painter's plastic to the ceiling. Damp-mopping the floor will keep your feet from stirring up dust. Don't use a fan to speed up drying time. Wear clean clothes and a hat to keep hair out of the finish. An hour or so before you paint, shut off furnaces, the A/C and ceiling fans to let the dust settle.

# **SWAP PLUGGED NOZZLES**

Most nozzles have a universal fit. If you end up with a plugged nozzle and have other cans of spray paint with good nozzles, just swap the bad one for a new one. They lift right off and push on. If you don't have any good nozzles, remove the plugged one and soak it in nail polish remover, acetone or even mineral spirits.



# START WITH A TACK COAT

 If you're spraying a vertical surface, it's always smart to apply a "tack" coat before applying the first full coat. A tack coat is a light mist that you allow to set for five minutes. The texture of the tack coat will help hold the paint in place and reduce runs.

# **SPRAY** ANYTHING

The Spra-Tool is a simple product-a plastic jar plus an aerosol can. You just pour the liquid into the jar and pull the trigger. We had great results with thin liquids like stain, shellac and household cleaners. With thicker material-polyurethane and latex paint-we had to



add thinner to achieve a smooth coat. In some cases, we added more thinner than the paint manufacturer recommended. (Using too much thinner can affect the paint's durability, but we didn't have a problem.) Still, we got smooth, perfect finishes-fast. The Spra-Tool kit (about \$12) is available at some home centers and online.

## **NEED A CUSTOM-COLOR** SPRAY PAINT?

If you want to paint radiators, electrical cover plates, a shelf or anything else to match your wall or trim color, go online and search for "custom spray paint." You'll find many companies (myperfectcolor. com is one) that can custom-mix just about any color you want, provided you know the paint manufacturer and color name. If you want a different shade of an existing color, choose one of the other shades from the paint swatch you got at the home center or paint store and have that color custom-mixed.

Directions: Use outdoors, or in well-ventilated area, when temperature is above 50°F (10°C) and humidity is below 85% to ensure proper drying. Do not apply to surfaces that exceed 200°F. Avoid spraying in very windy, dusty conditions. Cover nearby objects to protect from spray mist.

Remove loose paint and rust with a wire brush or sandpaper. Lightly sand glossy surfaces. Clean with soap and water, rinse and let dry. Shake can vigorously for one minute after mixing balls begin to rattle. Shake often during use. Hold can upright 12-16' from surface and spray in a steady back-and-forth motion, elightly overlanging each stroke. Kasp the can the same distance from the surface and in motion while soraying. Seekly 2 or more light coats a few minutes apart.



Do not burn or place in home trash compactor.

# **9.** READ THE DIRECTIONS!

This sounds obvious, but few people bother to read the directions on the can. If the manufacturer says to apply a tack coat or start with a primer, there's probably a good reason for it. One of the most important pieces of information is the drying time between coats. Often, you can apply a second coat soon afterward. But if you miss that window, you may have to wait a long time to apply the next coat.





HANG 'EM HIGH

If the project parts are small enough, you can suspend them for painting. You'll be able to paint all sides at the same time and have everything at eye level. Use coat hangers, wires, thumbtacks, screws—whatever you have on hand. Wear an activated carbon respirator when you spray-paint, especially if you're painting indoors.

MANY LIGHT COATS

It's common knowledge that you should apply several light coats rather than one or two heavy ones. But few have the discipline to follow this simple advice. When you're spraying, resist the temptation to fill in thinner areas on one pass to completely cover the surface. Or welcome to dealing with runs—yet again.

# 12 AUTHENTIC-LOOK HARDWARE...

When I bought my 1923-vintage house, the two exterior doors were original, as were the doorknobs. Unfortunately, the previous owners had installed shiny new brass dead bolts and escutcheon plate—a bad mismatch. Instead of scouring local antiques stores to find replacements, I decided to try painting the brass.

After removing the hardware, I scuffed the brass finish with fine sandpaper. Then I sprayed on a coat of primer and a few coats of Rust-Oleum's hammered-finish spray paint. The hammered finish provided the aged bronze look I was after. I was amazed at how well the repainted hardware matched the old doorknobs, and the paint job has held up, inside and out, for more than 10 years. So here's my advice: Don't replace ugly metal hardware. Save money by refinishing it with a metallic spray paint. – **VERN JOHNSON, ART DIRECTOR**



# **Best ProTips**

**Expert advice from the job site. By Mark Petersen**

A beautiful finish is all about proper preparation, a suitable workspace and the right products. We asked Gary Hakkinen, a painting veteran of 40-plus years, to show us his best practices for perfection. Here are a few of his favorite staining, sanding and finishing tips to help you create rich, silky-smooth trim.

# **BEST PRO TIPS**



# Sand wood for even finishes

The trim you bought may look perfect, but it likely has imperfections from machining that won't show up until you stain it. Sand every contour and flat area in the direction of the grain with a combination of medium-grit sanding sponges and pads. When necessary, fold 120-grit paper to get into tight cracks.



# Dry-brush crevices

Stain will pool in cracks. Use a dry paintbrush to remove it from each piece after it's been completely wiped. Wipe the brush on a clean rag or brush it on newspaper to clean off the stain between strokes.



Try out the stain on a sample of the same wood you plan to finish. You can create your own custom color by mixing two or three stains (of the same type) together. If you go this route, it's important to mix up a batch big enough to finish all the wood. The odds of achieving identical results on the second batch are slim. Keep a little extra on hand for touch-ups and repairs.



# Stain one piece at a time

Saturate the wood with a liberal coat of stain using a natural-bristle brush. Wipe off the stain with clean cotton rags in the same order you put it on. That will enable the stain to soak into all areas of the wood for about the same amount of time. Wipe with light, even pressure. Refold the wiping rags frequently so you have a dry cloth for most of the strokes, and grab a new rag whenever one gets soaked. Work on one piece of trim at a time to keep the stain from drying before wiping.



Apply sanding sealer first

Sanding sealer is the perfect foundation for the clear coat. It's formulated to dry quickly and has more solids than conventional clear coats, making it very easy to sand. And varnish adheres better to a well-sanded, sealed surface. Pick a sealer that's designed for the overlying finish, preferably the same brand. After the sanding sealer dries, sand it with fine-grit sandpaper and sanding sponges. Remove dust with a tack cloth.



# Long strokes = a smooth finish

If you can, arrange your trim boards in such a way that after you brush on the desired amount of finish, you can make your last couple strokes in one continuous pass. That will ensure no overlap marks. If you do end up with imperfections after the finish dries, sand them out when you sand before the next coat.



# Clean the room

If possible, do your sanding and finishing in different rooms. All that sanding dust will affect the clear coats. If you have to sand and finish in the same area, do whatever you can to clean the room before applying the sanding sealer and clear coat. If you're in a garage, open the overhead door and use a leaf blower to blow dust outside. Use a shop vacuum on the floor, and damp-mop it so your feet don't stir up dust.


# **BEST PRO TIPS**

Don't skimp on the brush

Buy a 2-in. or 2-1/2-in. brush, and don't spend less than \$10. If you take care of it and clean it well, a top-quality brush will last a long time. A cheap brush is more likely to leave brush marks and shed bristles that could get stuck in the finish. China (natural) bristle brushes are the choice for oil-based products; synthetic for water-based.







Oil-based finishes are a little more durable than water-based, but the difference isn't nearly as great as it was 10 years ago. Oil will yellow unstained wood more than water-based products will, which can be good or bad depending on the look you're after. Yellowing isn't an issue with stained wood. Water-based products dry faster, which helps keep dust from settling into the finish, but fast drying may be a disadvantage for slower, meticulous workers. Cleanup is easier with water-based products, and the odor isn't nearly as strong.



# Dispose rags

Rags soaked with oil-based products can spontaneously combust and burn down your house. Spread out stainsoaked rags away from other combustible items, and let them dry before disposing of them.



# Polyurethane vs. varnish

What's the difference between polyurethane and varnish? The quick-and-dirty answer: Varnish contains a resin and a solvent (oil or water). Once varnish is applied to wood, the solvent evaporates and the protective resin is left behind. Varnish can contain one of a few different resins, and polyurethane is one of them. Varnish that contains polyurethane just goes by the name polyurethane. The upside to polyurethane is that it's tougher (like a plastic coating) than the other varnishes. The downside is that it can appear cloudy when it's applied too thick, and it's harder to sand between coats.

# Three sliding options

Before you start shopping for hardware, take a careful look at the area where you would like to install the door and figure out what door setup works best. If you want to cover the opening with one door, you'll need an area on one side of the opening that's wide enough for the door. Make sure there aren't any obstructions like light switches, sconce lights or heat registers that would be covered by or interfere with the door. If there's not enough wall space on one side of the opening, you can install a pair of doors that slide to opposite sides, or buy special bypass hardware that allows the doors to stack.



### **SINGLE DOOR**

This is the most popular choice, but you'll need enough wall space. Order a track that's at least twice as wide as the door.



### **DOUBLE DOORS**

If you don't have enough wall space on one side of the opening for a single large door, you can use two doors instead. Centering the track on the opening will allow the doors to slide to the sides of the opening.



### **BYPASS DOORS**

If you want to install barn doors on a closet opening, or on an opening that goes wall to wall, you can order bypass hardware that allows you to stack the doors on one side of the opening.



# Time, tools and materials

Wheel

The 1x6 No. 2 pine boards we used for this door are inexpensive, so be sure to buy several extras so you can experiment with the distressing and staining techniques before you start on the boards you'll use. Preparing the boards is the most time-consuming part of this project. Expect to spend several hours cutting the rabbets on the edges of the 1x6s. We used a router with a rabbeting bit to cut the rabbets; a table saw with a dado blade set would be quicker.

The grinder and knot cup brush we used make quick work of the initial distressing. It took me about 10 minutes per board. If you don't own a grinder, you can buy one for about \$30 to \$150. A cheap one will work fine for this project. You

could also use a knot cup wire brush mounted in a corded drill, but it would take you longer to achieve the same results.

Staining goes quickly, but set aside a day or two to get the parts cut and finished. Barn door hardware ranges in price from about \$250 to \$500 depending on the size and style. Some companies have ready-to-ship options, but you should plan ahead if you need something else since it usually requires longer to get.

# Measure the opening

Whether you're building a door or ordering one, here's what you need to know about door size. Sliding doors should extend at least an inch beyond the sides of the opening that don't have trim, or an inch

beyond the moldings of openings with trim. You can add more overlap for extra privacy. To determine the door width, add at least 2 in. to the width of the opening, or to the outside dimensions of the door trim (**Photo 1**).

Choose your hardware before determining the door height. Then check the measuring instructions or ask the manufacturer for help arriving at the door height. In most cases, measuring to the top of an opening with no trim, or to the top of the trim, and subtracting 1/2 in. from your measurement will give you the minimum door height required.

Finally, you have to make sure you allow enough clearance above the opening to lift the door onto the track. This distance varies depending on your hardware, so again, check with the manufacturer.



Apply a base coat of stain

Roll or brush an even coat of light-colored stain over each board.

Wipe off the excess stain with a rag.



**Add dark stain**Dab dark stain over the board with a rag in a random pattern. Then spread out the dabs of stain to create dark areas and streaks. Finally, wipe off the excess dark stain with a different rag.



**Finish with gray stain**• Wipe on the topcoat of gray stain with a rag. Apply an uneven coat of stain, letting some of the previous layers show through. Wipe off the excess gray stain with a rag. Let the boards dry overnight.

# Three ways to support the track

To support a door, the track needs to be solidly mounted to wall framing. There are three options. First, you could install continuous wood backing between the wall studs at the track height. This allows you the freedom to install track-mounting screws at any location. But this method isn't practical in a room that's finished because you

would have to remove the drywall or plaster to install the blocking.

The second option is to mount a header board to the wall surface, making sure it's securely screwed to the studs, and screw the track to the header board. One manufacturer recommends a maximum door weight of 75 lbs. if you're using this method because the support screws will only be engaged in 3/4-in.-thick wood.

The third option is to bolt the track directly to the studs. You have to do two things if you choose this method. First, make sure to order an undrilled track. You'll need to

drill holes yourself at the stud locations. And

second, ask the supplier to recommend hardware to avoid crushing the drywall. Most suppliers have crush plates or something similar to solve the problem.

# Get the right spacers and floor guides

Included in the track mounting hardware will be some sort of spacers or stand-offs that hold the track away from the wall to allow the door to slide freely. Some companies supply spacers in different lengths, while others supply adjustable-length spacers. The length of the spacers is determined by your track mounting method, whether there is trim around the door or at the floor that you must clear, and the thickness of

your door. Be sure to double-check with the supplier before placing your order to make sure you're getting the correct length spacers for your situation.







**Square the vertical slats**Arrange the slats on 2x4s and space them with pennies. Align the ends and screw wood scraps to the 2x4s to hold the boards in place. Then line up the ends and check the door for square by making sure the diagonal measurements are equal.

You'll also need a guide at the floor to prevent the bottom of the door from swinging. The simplest guide is an L-shaped metal bracket that mounts to the floor and fits into a groove cut in the bottom of the door. If your door doesn't have a groove in it, there are roller guides and adjustable roller guides that will work. Choose the guide that works best for your door.



# Make shiplap boards

We used inexpensive 1x6 No. 2 pine boards, cut rabbets on the edges to make shiplap boards, and distressed and stained them to resemble old barn wood. When you choose boards, don't worry about knots, scratches or gouges. But try to pick boards that are straight and not cupped or warped.

We divided the width of the door by the board width to see how many boards we would need. And then we adjusted the board width until they were all equal. When you're doing the math, remember to account for the shiplap edges.

For our 4-ft.-wide door, we cut each board 5 in. wide. Yours may be different. Cut the boards to the right width and cut rabbets on two edges of all but two boards. Cut one rabbet on two boards that will

be used on the outside edges. **Photo 1** shows how we used a 3/8-in. rabbeting bit to cut the rabbets. A table saw with a dado blade will also work.

We also cut the boards to the right length before distressing them so we could make the ends look aged. At the same time, cut the two horizontal rails and the two 3-in.-wide blocks that go under the hangers. Make the horizontal rails 2 in. shorter than your door width.

# Grind, scratch and beat the boards

When all the parts are cut, you're ready for the fun part-distressing



Fasten the rails

• Measure and mark for the rails. Ours are 8 in. from the top and bottom of the door. Apply construction adhesive to the back of the rails and place them on the door. Attach the rails with nails. We staggered the nails up and down on each board, but you can use any pattern you like.

Mark for the hanger boles

Follow the manufacturer's instructions for mounting the hangers. We're using a 2-1/2-in. spacer to ensure the wheel is the correct distance from the top of the door. Mark the hole locations. Then drill holes and mount the hangers on the door.



the boards. **Photo 2** shows how to use a brush knot cup mounted in an angle grinder to abrade the soft wood and expose the grain. This gives the wood a weathered look. Pieces of wire from the cup can break off and cause serious injury if you're not protected, and there's a lot of dust. Make sure to wear safety goggles, hearing protection and a good-quality dust mask.

Start by nailing the board to the sawhorses with finish nails to hold it in place. The nail holes will add to the rustic appearance. Tip the grinder so the wheel is on edge and parallel to the grain to wear away the soft wood. Use the wire wheel on the edges and ends of the board to create an uneven, worn look. You can also hold the wheel flat on the surface and move it in arcs across the wood to

resemble saw marks. Don't worry; you can't go wrong here. Wearing away any amount of wood will look great.

If you want to take your distressing to the next level, use an awl to create "wormholes" (**Photo 3**). You don't have to put holes in every board. Some variety will add authenticity. Drag a screwdriver or other sharp object along the grain to create a fake crack. Use your hammer claw or any other tool or heavy object to create dents and gouges. When you're done distressing the boards, it's time to stain them.

# Add layers of stain

To achieve the look you see here, start by applying a base coat of light gold stain to the boards (**Photo 4**). We applied the stain with a mini roller to speed up the

process. Wipe off excess stain with a rag. Then use a rag to apply an uneven coat of dark stain (Photo **5**). Wipe off the excess to expose some of the base coat color. Finally, apply a thin, uneven layer of gray stain, dabbing and wiping to create an aged look (**Photo 6**). It'll look better if the stain is less consistent. Also, don't worry if the finish is different from one board to another. The variation will add an authentic look when the door is assembled. Don't forget to finish the ends and edges of the boards. Let the stain dry overnight before moving on to the door assembly.

Most stain brands have colors that will work well for aging wood. Here are the colors we used:

Base coat: Varathane Summer Oak
Second coat: Varathane Kona
Third coat: Varathane
Weathered Gray

### Assemble the door

Start by arranging the vertical boards on a pair of 2x4s placed flat on sawhorses or the floor. Arrange the 2x4s so they're lined up under the locations of the horizontal rails. Space the boards top and bottom with pennies. Screw scraps of wood to the 2x4s on both sides of the door to hold the boards together while you add the horizontal rail. After checking to see that the ends of the boards are still lined up, measure diagonally from opposite corners to make sure the door is square (Photo 7). If necessary, adjust the position of the boards until the diagonal measurements are equal.

Next mark the height of the rails on the door and attach them with construction adhesive and nails (**Photo 8**). Since the fasteners show, we decided to use 1-1/2-in. wrought-head nails that we bought at rockler.com. Since the nails protruded slightly from the opposite side, we shortened them a bit by holding them with locking pliers and grinding off the tips on a bench grinder. You could also mount a metal grinding wheel in your angle grinder. Drill pilot holes



**Mount the track**Measure carefully to determine the track height. Hold the track level and in the correct position and mark the wall at each fastener hole. Drill pilot holes at the marks. Then attach the track to the wall with the fasteners and spacers provided in your hardware kit.



Hang the door
Set the door on the track. Carefully roll it to each end to determine where to place the stops. Install the stops, bottom guide and any other hardware to complete the project.

for the nails that are near the ends of the rails to avoid splitting the wood. If you don't mind the appearance of screw heads on the opposite side of the door, you could flip the door over and drive 1-1/4-in. screws through the boards into the rails for a little more strength.

If you prefer, you could brush on a coat of flat polyurethane. Test the finish on a scrap to see if you like it before you apply it to your door. We didn't put a finish on our door.

# Install the hangers and mount the track

Follow the instructions included with your door hardware to install the hangers. Our instructions recommended using a 2-1/2-in. spacer between the door and the wheel to hold the hanger in the correct position while marking the bolt locations (**Photo 9**). After

marking the bolt locations, drill holes for the bolts and mount the hangers on the door.

The steps you take to mount the track will depend on your track support. If you've installed continuous backing between the studs or are mounting the track on a header board, then you may be using a predrilled track and can proceed to bolt the track to the wall.

If you're mounting the track over the drywall and bolting it to studs, you'll have to locate and mark the studs, and then transfer the stud locations to the track so you can drill holes for the mounting screws in the right place. The instructions should give you a formula for determining the track height. Double-check your dimensions and math before mounting the track (**Photo 10**). You don't want to have to cut down the door or reposition the track if it's in the wrong spot.

With the track mounted, finish the job by putting the door on the

track (**Photo 11**) and mounting the end stops, bottom guides and any other hardware according to your instructions.



# UNDER-CABINET DRAWER

Extra storage right where you need it! by Travis Larson



### WHAT IT TAKES

TIME 1 hour\* **COST** \$20\*

**SKILL LEVEL**Beginner

**TOOLS** Basic hand tools, jigsaw or circular saw, drill, 18-gauge nailer

(A miter saw and a table saw will speed things up and give you better results.)

# Two boards and 1/4-in. plywood

This really is a simple project. For lumber, you'll need 1/4-in. plywood for each drawer bottom (see **Figure A**), 1x3 for the drawer box and 1x4 for the drawer supports, drawer front and trim board. (You'll need two trim boards if the drawer is visible from both sides.) We used poplar for all the parts because the exposed parts will be painted to match the cabinets. But if you have natural wood cabinets, choose your wood and finish to match. Paint or finish the drawer front and trim boards before installing them.

# Side-mount drawer slides made easy

Ordinarily, installing drawers with sidemount slides is very challenging. But with this technique (**Photos 4 - 6**), everything is built around the drawer, making it very easy.

Most upper cabinets are 12 in. deep. If that's the case with yours, you'll need a pair of 10-in. side-mount drawer slides (\$15 per pair) for each drawer. You won't find 10-in. slides at home centers; you'll have to search for them online or shop at a woodworking store. If you have unusually deep cabinets, you can create deeper drawers and use 12-in. slides, which are readily available at home centers.

## The cavity defines the drawer sizes

Peek under your cabinets and you'll see the cavities (Photo 1). You can put several drawers under a row of cabinets if you wish, but each cabinet needs a separate drawer. If you're putting in adjoining drawers, hold off on cutting the drawer fronts until all the drawers are installed so you can cut them to fit with even gaps between them. For single cabinet drawers, go ahead and cut the fronts the same length as the cabinet face. You won't need any drawer pulls. Because the drawer front drops about an inch below the drawer, you'll have a built-in lip on the underside for a finger pull.



SIZE THE DRAWER

Measure the cavity under the cabinet and cut a piece of 1/4-in. plywood 2-1/2 in. narrower and 1/4 in. shallower than those dimensions.



**BUILD THE DRAWER FRAME**Cut 1x3 frame parts to match the plywood dimensions, then glue and nail them together with 1-1/2-in. 18-gauge brads.



3 ADD THE DRAWER BOTTOM
Glue and nail the plywood to the frame using the plywood to square up the frame as you fasten it.




ATTACH THE DRAWER SLIDE Cut two 1x4s to the same length as the drawer sides, then attach the slides to the drawer supports, holding them flush with the bottom and the end. Use a self-centering drill bit in the round slide mounting holes before sinking the 1/2-in. screws.



**JOIN THE SLIDE** TO THE DRAWER

Pull out the slide on each drawer support a few inches to expose the mounting holes, then predrill and screw the slides to the drawer sides flush with the front.

Pull the slide out the rest of the way to mount the slide to the back end of the drawer.



# 7 STICK THE ASSEMBLY TO THE CABINET

Use double-face tape to temporarily stick the assembly to the underside of the cabinet. (Center it in the opening.)



# SCREW THE DRAWER SUPPORTS TO THE CABINET BOTTOM

Drill two I/8-in. pilot holes through the cabinet bottom, then screw into the drawer supports.



# STICK ON THE DRAWER FRONT Cut the 1x4 drawer front exactly the same length as the cabinet face frame. Use two nickels to space it from the cabinet frame while you attach it with double-face tape.



# 10. ATTACH THE DRAWER FRONT

Drill, then permanently attach the drawer front to the drawer frame from the inside with 1-1/4-in. screws.



# 11 CLAMP AND SCREW THE SIDE TRIM INTO PLACE

Drill pilot holes above the drawer slide and attach the side trim with 1-1/4-in. screws.



# Make your own stir sticks

Forgot to grab stir sticks at the store when you picked up the paint? If you have a band saw and a hunk of 2x4, you can make your own! Take a 2-ft.-long 2x4 and draw a perpendicular line in the middle. Next, "rip" several 3/16-in.-thick strips on the band saw up to the pencil line. Then, to release the stir sticks, chop the 2x4 at the pencil line. This method keeps your fingers a safe distance from the saw blade. - LES EASTEP, FIELD EDITOR



### Replace baseboard heater covers

ot old, rusty "hydronic" (hot water heat) baseboards? You could replace them in their entirety, but that's expensive and time consuming. You could also sand and paint them, but that's a lot of work.

The easiest option is to replace just the front covers and end caps with aftermarket ones made of plastic or metal, which are available at home centers and online. Supplyhouse.com (formerly pexsupply.

com) sells several styles of replacement covers, called "baseboarders," for about \$16 to \$27 per foot. End caps cost about \$16 to \$28 apiece. The company's website has easy-to-follow installation videos.





# Chirping smoke detectors

ver been driven crazy in the middle of the night by a chirping smoke detector? One of your detectors has a dying battery, but determining which detector is chirping is surprisingly tough.

Instead of trying to figure out which smoke detector has the dying battery, just replace the batteries in all the smoke detectors at the same time to eliminate the guesswork. Also be sure to replace any smoke detectors that are older than 10 years because they're no longer reliable.

If there's no manufacture date on any of your smoke detectors, just replace them to be safe. Some newer ones have 10-year batteries in them that you never have to replace; you just replace the smoke detector.

# **Got wasps?**

f you have a nest of yellow jackets or paper wasps near your house and they're not bothering you, jrust leave them alone and let them eat the caterpillars and spiders in your yard. These types of wasps die off after a couple of hard frosts, anyway.

According to the "bee lab" at the University of Minnesota—beelab.umn. edu—only the new queens survive winter. They hibernate underground and establish new nests in the spring and don't reuse the old nest, whether

it's underground or inside an exterior wall of a house.

If you're really worried about getting stung, and the nest is visible, you can kill the entire nest with an aerosol spray product available at hardware stores and home centers. You just spray the product directly into the nest at sunset or sunrise (follow the directions on the can). Just make sure you're standing far away from the nest while you're spraying in case all the wasps decide to fly out and try to sting you.

# Another way to remove popcorn texture

e ran a story a few months ago on how to remove popcorn texture from ceilings. One of our readers, John McKinney, wrote to us with a tip of his own. "I use a Homax Popcorn Ceiling Scraper," says John. "It's a rectangular scraper that you screw onto a painting pole or broom handle. The rectangular part accepts a plastic grocery bag that catches most of the texture as you scrape it off. You can dump the bag when it gets too heavy or put on a new bag." The Homax popcorn scraper is available at home centers and online for about \$20. Thanks for the tip, John!

# Change Your **Engine** Coolant

ver time, engine coolant loses its anticorrosive properties and lubricating ability. Some carmakers recommend changing the coolant every 30,000 miles. The recommended change intervals vary widely, however, so check the maintenance schedule in your owner's manual.

You can change your coolant yourself in about an hour. You'll need to invest in an air-powered refilling tool to remove air pockets from the cooling system as you fill. You'll save about \$50 on your first coolant change and about \$100 on each one after that.

This procedure works for any cooling system that's not contaminated with rust or oil. I'll show you how to check yours and then how to change the coolant.

### Here's what you'll need:

- Coolant (2 gallons; about \$40)
- Air-powered refill tool (\$90)
- Air compressor
- Hose removal tool (\$8 at auto parts store or online)
- Shop manual to locate block drain plugs
- Drain pan and paper towels
- Wrenches and screwdrivers








**Remove the lower hose**Slip the pointed end of the removal tool all the way into the end of the hose. Then pull it around the radiator neck to break the hose loose. Then pull it off quickly and immediately direct the coolant into the drain pan.



**Vacuum-fill the cooling system**Insert the fill tube into the coolant bottle. Then open the valve and let the vacuum suck fresh coolant into the system. Repeat the procedure until the system is full.

To begin, check the condition of your coolant when the engine is cool. Remove the radiator or coolant reservoir cap and examine the coolant. If it looks rusty (don't confuse orange coolant with rust), has crud or oil floating on the top, or looks like chocolate milk, call it quits and take it to a pro. You have problems that this procedure won't solve.

If the coolant looks clean, start the job by jacking up the vehicle and supporting it with jack stands. Next, place a large drain pan under the radiator. Loosen the lower radiator hose clamp with pliers (spring-type clamp) or a screwdriver (worm-drive clamp) and remove the hose (**Photo 1**). If the hose won't budge, use a hose removal tool (one choice is Tool Aid No. SGT13860; about \$7 online) to break it loose (**Photo 1**). Let the radiator and water pump drain completely. Then reattach the lower radiator hose and clamp.

Next, locate and remove the block drain plugs (they're not in the same spot on every engine, so refer to a repair manual for the location of yours). Reinstall the block drain plugs and move on to the refilling step.

### **Refill with fresh coolant**

Insert the air-powered refilling tool (we used the UView 550500 AirLift II Economy Cooling System Refiller; \$90 online) into the radiator neck or overflow bottle. Connect the exhaust hose and compressed air line and route the open end of the tool's exhaust hose into an empty gallon jug or pail. Then open the valve and let the vacuum rise until the needle reaches the edge of the red zone on the gauge. Then fill with coolant (**Photo 2**). The vacuum sucks out any air pockets as it refills the system. When it's full, just reinstall the radiator or overflow tank caps, remove the jack stands, and go for a spin.

# **Buying the right coolant**

Most DIYers buy coolant at the auto parts store, which carries a product labeled "universal," meaning it works in all cars. The carmakers disagree. Over the past several years, they've issued service bulletins warning that "universal" coolants are often incompatible with the newer metal alloys and gaskets and seals used in their vehicles. The carmakers aren't saying that just to increase sales of their proprietary coolants. They're seeing real (and expensive) damage caused by these coolants.

If you use the wrong coolant, you won't see the damage for a few years. But when you do, it'll cost you a bundle. So heed the manufacturer's warnings and buy coolant right from the dealer. It'll cost about \$6 more per gallon (most vehicles need 2 gallons), but the peace of mind is worth it.




You have three options when it comes to getting on the LED shop light bandwagon. The prices below assume 48-in. bulbs and two-bulb fixtures.

- 1. Buy replacement "ballast-compatible" bulbs for about \$15 each. Open the fixture and locate the ballast model number. Then search the LED bulb manufacturer's website for compatible bulbs. The downside to this approach is that you're still relying on an old ballast that will eventually fail. And a ballast costs \$15 to \$35 to replace.
- 2. Buy entirely new replacement LED fixtures. The cheapest LED fixtures cost less than \$40, including bulbs. They're easy to swap in if yours are suspended by chains—not as easy if they're permanently mounted and hardwired. The advantage: You'll never have to replace any ballasts.




#### REMOVE THE COVER/ REFLECTOR

Then remove the end cap housing from one end of the fix-ture and cut the wires to the sockets. Remove and discard the old sockets.



#### CONNECT SOCKET WIRES Using a twist-on connector, connect the neutral wires from each new socket to the white wire from the cord or house wiring. Then connect the hot wires from each new socket to the black wire from the cord or house wiring using another twist-on connector.



#### CONNECT THE SOCKETS Insert a new white and black 18-gauge solid copper wire into each new socket. If you don't have 18-gauge wire on hand, you can repurpose the existing wires from your old ballast. Make sure you label the neutral wire from each socket by wrapping each end with white electrical tape.



#### REINSTALL THE END CAP AND REFLECTOR/COVER

Label the powered sockets with a marker and install the LED bulbs. Apply the supplied warning label to the fixture so that future users will know the fixture has been converted to use ballast-free/direct wire bulbs. Turn on the power and test the bulbs. Recycle the fluorescent bulbs.

#### CAN YOU USE YOUR OLD SOCKETS?

The answer is, probably not. Most older fluorescent fixtures have shunted sockets, which means the internal contacts are connected with a copper "shunt" strap. If you connect hot and neutral wires to a shunted socket, you'll create a dead short and possibly damage the new LED bulb.

You can determine what type is in your fixture with a continuity tester. Turn off the power to the fixture and disconnect the wires going to each socket. Probe across the copper contacts in each socket. If you get a continuity reading, the sockets are shunted and must be replaced with non-shunted units.

**3.** If you have lots of fluorescent fixtures or fixtures that are permanently wired, consider converting them to use "ballast-free/direct wire" LED bulbs. They cost about \$15 each. (If you have lots of lights, you can buy in bulk to reduce the price to \$10 per bulb.) These bulbs don't need a ballast because the power wires connect directly to two of the fixture's sockets.

The advantage of this option is that you'll never have to worry about replacing ballasts. You'll reuse your existing fixtures, and the conversion is simple. The steps are shown on p. 73.

# SHOP FOR LEDS AND SOCKETS

Before you go online or shop at the home center, make sure you know what kind of bulbs you have (T5, T8 or T12). Buy bulbs that are labeled "ballast-free/direct wire" (see "Before You Buy," below). You may need one new nonshunted socket for each new bulb (see "Can You Use Your Old Sockets?" on p. 73).

Some LED bulb manufacturers include a socket with each bulb, but since there are nearly 10 socket sizes and styles, the included sockets may not fit your fixture. Since most home centers don't stock all the different types, you can contact the bulb manufacturer or buy the correct one online. Double-check the socket fit before you start the conversion. Never try to modify a socket to fit your fixture!

#### CONVERT YOUR FIXTURE

Ballast-free/direct wire LED bulbs get power from only one end and use the socket on the opposite end only to hold the bulb in place. Start by unplugging the fixture or turning off the circuit breaker if it's hardwired. See **Photos 1 - 4** for the rest of the conversion steps. Leave the old ballast in the fixture or recycle it—don't toss it in the trash.

#### Before you buy

■ Decide whether you want a clear or diffused lens. Choose a clear lens if the fixture is directly over your work area and a diffused lens for lighting large areas.

#### CHECK OLD FLUORESCENT BULB FOR COLOR TEMPERATURE





Check the label info on your current bulbs to find their color temperature. If you're happy with the color, buy it again. If not, choose a color based on the room and task.

WARM/ SOFT WHITE 3,000° Kelvin. Best for living room, kitchen, bedrooms.

NEUTRAL/ COOL 4,000° Kelvin. Best for workshops. DAYLIGHT/ COLD WHITE 6,000° Kelvin. Provides the greatest contrast. Best for intricate work.

■ Then check the packaging before you buy to make sure the label says the bulbs are "Ballast-Free" or "Direct Wire" to indicate the bulbs are designed to work without a ballast. Finally, check the bulb's brightness level to make sure it provides the same illumination as your fluorescents, if not better. For comparison, fluorescent bulbs typically provide 2,000 to 3,000 lumens.







#### **THREADED** PIPE BOMB

he discharge pipe on this water heater has threads on the end. That can be dangerous, and it's not allowed by plumbing codes. Here's why:

If the pressure inside a water heater gets too high, a TPR (temperature and pressure relief) valve lets out a little water through the discharge pipe. Anyone seeing that puddle might assume it's a problem and "fix" it by screwing a cap onto the pipe. That blocks the TPR valve, and the pressure that builds up can cause the water heater to explode.

#### The right way

The plumber should have cut off the threads before installing this pipe.


