Kohler's PerfectFill smart bath technology will fill your tub to your preferred depth and temp. Program ideal tub settings for everyone in your home (photo above).

How about smart lightbulbs that monitor your health? Yes, please. From Sengled, these lights can monitor your sleep, heart rate, temperature and other vital signs. They can even detect if someone has fallen. No cameras—they use biometric data to detect changes.

With dual cameras, the new Eufy Video Doorbell 2K captures people and packages with clarity. And it's battery powered.

HOMEOWNERS & EARTH DAY

ow many times have you asked, "Is this recyclable?" Then you look for the little symbol with the circular arrows. (If you've never asked that, make it your goal, on Earth Day, April 22, to recycle something.) That symbol on a plastic jug or a glass bottle means one of two things. First, the item is recyclable somewhere, just maybe not in your area. Second, the item may be made from recycled material.

The bottles, cans and papers that are recyclable vary by city nationwide, and it depends mainly on a city's capabilities for sorting and processing materials. The manufacturers of those materials show that recycling symbol on their products with no knowledge of local recycling rules. They simply know whether it is technically possible to recycle their product. Check with your city or trash hauler to learn what you can and cannot recycle.

FROM YOUR KITCHEN:

- Cardboard pizza boxes? Yes, but take out the thin paper liner and the crust you didn't eat.
- Plastic beverage containers? Yes, but give them a quick rinse (not a thorough cleaning) and put the top back on.
- To-go food containers? No, polystyrene plastic food containers and drinking cups are generally not recyclable.

FROM YOUR GARAGE:

- Old garden hose? Worn extension cord? No and no, residential recycling companies call these "tanglers" because they tie up machines and can iniure workers.
- Old tools? Maybe, but first ask yourself if you can fix the tool or donate it. Check with the tool manufacturer or the retailer where you purchased it; some offer recycling. And for battery-powered tools, always recycle those cells. Check www.call2recycle.org for locations.
- Oil and chemicals? Some, like motor oil, are easy to recycle. Others, like paint and pesticides, are hazardous waste. Dispose of them appropriately.



so I can neatly pile the trimmings. The serrated edge opposite the hook lets me saw through dense weeds and beefy branches. And the small tip end is handy for splitting perennials.

The tool's handle seems custom made; I have a sure grip when I'm swinging at the weeds and heavy growth. A nylon sheath wraps the tool securely when I'm finished. You can find the Fiskars Billhook for about \$35 at home centers and hardware stores.

orking (or playing) outside when it's brutally hot is zero fun. But if you can't avoid it, you can at least make it a bit more comfortable with the Ryobi Bucket Top Misting Fan. It'll keep you cooler by blowing a fine mist toward you while you work. And it's battery powered, so you can take it anywhere.

Place it on top of a 5-gallon bucket filled with water or connect it to a garden hose for a continuous supply of water. The fan tilts, so you can adjust the angle to hit you just right, and the mist and fan have two settings. The fine mist will keep you damp, not soaked, and you'll feel much cooler and be able to work longer. A fully charged battery lasts three to four hours. Find the Bucket Top Misting Fan at home centers or online. A \$100 bill gets you the unit itself, a battery, a charger and a hose adapter.

FOOLPROOF FINISH

Applying a finish goes handin-hand with woodworking, but it's a completely different skill. And it's not easy to get a perfect finish. Brushed- or sprayed-on finishes often end up with "dust nibs" that you need to sand out, or on vertical surfaces these finishes can easily sag or drip. I've switched to General Finishes Gel Topcoat. It's about as close to foolproof as you can get.

Just slop it on with any old brush, wipe it off with a clean, soft rag and let it dry. You'll still need to sand lightly between coats, and you'll need to apply more coats than you do with a brushed-on finish to build up a protective film. But the results are worth it. You'll end up with that high-end "in the wood" look and feel to your finish, as opposed to the look of a layer of plastic sitting on top of the wood. Find General Finishes Gel Topcoat online or at specialty woodworking retailers. A quart will set you back about \$35.

DEAD-CENTER DRILLING

One of the most difficult parts of attaching cabinet hardware, such as hinges, is predrilling centered holes. I'm a big fan of self-centering drill bits. They come in many sizes to suit the hardware you're mounting. The outer sleeve contacts the circumference of the hole in the hinge, holding the bit dead-center as you drill.

From time to time, I've had a drill bit break, but they're easy to replace. They're usually just held in with a setscrew, so you can pop out the broken one and put in a new one in a few seconds. You can get sets for about \$25 at hardware stores, home centers and online.

WINDOW PAINT SCRAPER

It's hard to paint the wood around windows without getting some paint on the glass. Scraping it off with a razor blade can scratch the glass, or you might slip and cut the painted wood or yourself. I make a scraper by cutting a bevel on each end of a 3/4-in. scrap of hardwood. It takes the paint off cleanly without marring the window. When the bevels get dull, I cut new ones.




CAULK ORGANIZER

ere's a great way to store tubes of leftover caulk. Hang a piece of coated wire closet shelving upside down so the shelf edge supports the tubes. I used shelf clips to hang mine and spaced the bottom away from the wall with a strip of wood.



tape measure is a pretty reliable tool. You probably have several around your house and work area. They're inexpensive and easy to use. So, do you need a digital measuring device? I mean, if it ain't broke ... right? But we love new digital devices, and we found three unique tools all promising a better way to measure. It just depends on what you need to measure.

DIGITAL TAPE MEASURE

The KOISS model K519 digital tape measure looks like any other tape, aside from the buttons and small LCD screen. This tool uses a standard pull-out, retractable, locking tape that reaches 16 ft. When you pull the tape across a board, wall or table—whatever you're measuring—the LCD screen reads the length continuously.

With the push of a button, you can set it to measure from either end of the device. It will store two measurements, can instantly figure the halfway point if needed, and displays in feet, feet and inches, inches, or centimeters. And the tape itself has bold markings in both metric and standard, though it

doesn't highlight 16s or even feet. It's a sleek and simple package available in multiple colors for about \$30.

LASER DISTANCE MEASURE

The Bosch GLM 20X (shown) is a laser distance tool that reads distances up to 65 ft.,

and it's compact, just 4 by 1-1/2 in., so it can fit neatly in your pocket. The one-button tool reads clearly and accurately for gathering floor or wall measurements.

With a backlit display, it works indoors or outdoors

and is rated to work in temps as low as 14 degrees F. This tool is available at home centers for about \$50.

If you need more advanced features, try the Bosch GLM165-27CG, which measures up to 165 ft. with a bright green laser display and Bluetooth connectivity (we did not test this device). This tool stores 30 measurements, adds and subtracts, and calculates area and volume. It retails for \$170.

DUAL TAPE & LASER DISTANCE MEASURE

The HISS laser tape is a dual-function device with a 16-ft. pull-out tape and a side-mounted laser that measures up to 60 meters (nearly 200 ft.). The tape measure is autolocking with a grippy, rubbercoated, magnetized hook end. The nylon-coated tape is highlighted for feet and at 16s, has metric markings, and is two-sided, with the bottom side showing convenient fractional notations.

The laser measuring feature is simple to use and calculates distance from the front or the rear of the unit. Just place the device, aim its red laser light and press the "Read" button. The laser gave accurate readings across the several lengths I tested. The "Unit" button lets you toggle between standard and metric readouts.

The tool runs on two AAA batteries, has a convenient strap handle and is enveloped in a durable plastic. I dropped the device several times—as I do with tape

measures—and have had no problems with its functioning. This tool is available online for \$50.

BUY BATTERIES ONCE

had to ask myself, "If most of my tools, both shop tools and lawn tools, run on rechargeable lithium-ion batteries, why am I still buying single-use AA and AAA alkaline batteries?" The honest answer is purchase ease. One little AA power pack costs about a buck, maybe less, and packs of these are often located near the checkout so I never forget to grab a quantity when I'm out shopping.

I heard about a company called Pale Blue that sells rechargeable lithium-ion batteries, and I purchased a four-pack of AA batteries online for \$30. That price hits with a jolt—these batteries cost roughly seven times more than regular alkaline AAs. And when I think of all the items in my house running on AA or AAA batteries, I would need to spend several hundred dollars to go fully rechargeable. Yet, I started with the four-pack and inserted them into my computer keyboard and mouse not big power drainers, but they both get heavy use.

Rechargeable AA batteries are not new, and I've tried them before. All those were nickel-metal hydride (NiMH) batteries that you recharge using a plug-in cradle. Tool manufacturers moved away from NiMH batteries a few years ago for several reasons, but most AA/AAA rechargeables still use NiMH cells. The main weakness of NiMH batteries is they self-drain when not in use. Keep them in a drawer and they'll discharge over time. Plus, I would often misplace that charging cradle.

The Pale Blue AAs I bought eliminate both those problems. Lithium-ion batteries hold a charge when not in use. And these are charged using each battery's micro-USB port and a 4-into-1 USB cable. I've already used and recharged these batteries twice, reducing that initial cost. The manufacturer claims they will take up to 1,000 recharges. That would seem to be a longer life than a regular alkaline battery. Maybe I will replace all my batteries!

HATE WINDOW SCREENS? HIDE 'EM

More than 85 percent of Pella Windows customers choose windows with screens, but according to the manufacturer, many of those buyers don't like the look of screens. Plus, they think it's a hassle to remove, store, clean and reinstall them. For those reasons, the company created its new Hidden Screen design for select windows in its 250-series product line of doublehung, single-hung and sliding windows.


The Hidden Screen is a pleated screen cloth of extruded aluminum that folds open when the window is opened, and folds away when it's closed, eliminating the task of removing



and storing screens for the winter. Pella engineers claim the screens have endured durability testing of some 9,400 open-close

cycles, which equals one cycle a day for 25 years. The company also tested the screens for their ability to keep bugs out.

Current customers can retrofit their 250-series windows to accept the new Hidden Screen. Installation requires a Pella-approved installer.



A 3D TOUR CAN HELP YOU SELL, RENT OR REDESIGN YOUR HOME

igh demand and a comparatively low supply of existing homes helped make 2021 a big year for home sales. Homes moved fast in high-priced markets. The activity could slow in 2022, and if you're considering selling a home, you need to be aware of all the new tools available in the real estate market.

"As a home seller, you want as many eyeballs on your property as possible," says Mike Velez of BLDG Realty in Chino Hills, California. "Realtors used to send postcards to show homes locally, but today's audience is the whole world, especially during COVID with remote work letting people live nearly anywhere. I sold a home in Southern California to a couple from South Carolina, and they didn't set foot on the property until they owned it. I'm not the only one doing that."

One of Velez's favorite tools is a 3D tour. Using the Matterport 360-degree camera and 3D-tour technology (matterport.com), agents and home sellers can show a home's features beyond just wall colors and floor coverings. A 3D tour lets shoppers see a home's

interior from every angle, giving room measurements, window sizes and specifics of kitchen countertop materials, appliance features and much more.

"Good photography is the foundation of every home sale," says Velez. "Every buyer wants information about room sizes, materials and feature details." Realtors like Velez pay the cost of Matterport's 3D-tour service, and the video can be captured using one or more cameras. For owners of vacation rentals or Airbnb properties, the same 3D-tour features can help promote property rentals.

Matterport might also be a worthwhile tool, literally, in a home-remodeling project. When paired with a software such as RoomSketcher, Matterport can help you visualize new flooring, select and place different furniture, or even move walls and resize rooms. Along with the 3D visualization features, you can create twodimensional floor plans with roomsize specifications, which can be helpful for estimating prices of carpet or hardwood flooring.







SPRAY CAN O' CEMENT

On a recent trip to the hardware store. I noticed a can of cement spray paint. It's not for cement; it looks like cement. In the Rust-Oleum Specialty paint line, this faux finish adds interesting detail to otherwise boring household objects.

I bought a can (\$8) and took it into my workshop along with a clear glass vase. To prep the vase, I taped off the half I didn't want painted, then scuffed the glass to better accept the paint. Even more than most spray paints, this one will run and drip if you're not careful. I sprayed four coats, lightly sanding down a few drips in between. I then warned my wife—look for more cement-covered vases in the house!

MASTER YOUR CIRCULAR SAW WITH THESE TIPS

reached-for tools in my garage, the circular saw is an essential tool for DIYers of all skill levels. The "circ" saw is uber-versatile; if you need a straight cut of any kind, a circular saw can do it. Follow along to learn circular saw skills and to find out what type of saw you should reach for in your shop.

ne of the most

SAFETY FIRST

Always wear hearing and eye protection when you use any power saw, and keep loose-fitting sleeves, long hair and hoodie drawstrings tucked away. When making a cut, keep hands in front of and away from the saw, never behind it.



ADJUST BLADE DEPTH

When a lot of the saw blade extends beneath your material, you increase the possibility of cutting something you don't intend to cut. As a rule of thumb, set your blade depth so that just a bit more than the teeth protrudes through the material.



DON'T BIND THE BLADE


When a circular saw blade gets pinched or twisted while making a cut, the blade can kick back toward you with force. This is almost completely avoidable. Don't rush, keep your saw cuts straight and position the cutoff side of your workpiece to fall away from the blade. Never cut between supported ends, such as in the middle of two sawhorses, where the cut will fall into the saw blade.

CUTS OF ALL KINDS

Whether you're cutting 2x4s to length, breaking down plywood sheets into a manageable size, creating joinery, or making angled and beveled cuts, reach for a do-it-all circ saw.

• ANGLE: Changing the angle of the saw relative to the material you are cutting





CROSSCUT: Sawing across the grain of solid lumber



BEVEL: Changing the angle of the blade relative to the saw's shoe

COMPOUND: Sawing at an angle with the blade set at a bevel

Your circular saw can cut far more than just 2x4s and plywood, and specialty blades are available to help you cut other materials.

MASONRY: Repair a driveway crack or cut landscape blocks and pavers with a diamond blade in your circular saw. These blades are common for tile saws or angle grinders but also come in sizes to fit your circular saw.

METAL: Install a steel-cutting blade to cut cleanly through tough metal. Check that your circular saw does not exceed the blade's rpm rating. The Cermet blade by Diablo is a heat-tolerant blade that cuts up to 3/8-in.-thick steel, without heating up the material or leaving sharp burrs.





PLASTIC: I learned to cut material such as vinyl siding by flipping the blade to spin backward. This is a bad idea. Instead, use a blade for cutting composite material. They are configured to cut—not melt—plastic and other composite materials, as well as aluminum. For more on saw blades, see p. 34.





A specific circular saw exists for the work you do most often. If you only cut 2x4s, you don't need a bigger saw. If you need to cut flooring easily, there is a saw that does that better. Getting the right saw for the job makes your work easier. Here are the types of saws and what they're best at cutting.

TRADITIONAL/ SIDEWINDER

This is the circular saw that everybody knows. The motor is mounted on the left and spins a 7-1/4-in. blade on the right. Tried and true, this saw can handle most of the jobs a DIYer has on his or her weekend projects list. It is also available in a left-handed version with the motor on the right and the blade on the left.

COMPACT/ FLOORING SAW

Equipped with a much smaller 4-1/2-in. blade, this saw still has the ability to cut 2-by material, but it excels at cutting flooring and sheet goods. The barrel handle design on these saws gives them a unique operating feel, and they demand different use habits for safety.

WORM DRIVE

Most circular saws are direct drive, meaning the saw blade is connected directly to the motor's spindle. A wormdrive saw has the blade in front of the motor. Gears perpendicular to the motor spin the blade. Some framing carpenters favor gear-driven saws. They're narrower and heavier than traditional circular saws but are more powerful and track straight when you're making long cuts. Two versions of this saw, worm drive and hypoid drive, use slightly different style gears; both need gear oil for maintenance.

TRIM SAW

A smaller version of a traditional circular saw, a trim saw has a 6-1/2-in. blade and typically comes in a bladeleft orientation, although some use a blade-right setup. This saw's smaller blade results in less cutting-depth capacity, but its light weight and easy handling make trim saws shine for out-of-shop tasks.



BEAM CUTTER

When you need to cut large timbers for landscaping or a thick slab for a project, check out a beam cutter, such as this one by Prazi (\$170 at praziusa.com). This attachment fits a variety of 7-1/4-in. sidewinder saws. Bolt one on and you'll be able to cut lumber up to 12 in. thick.

SO SIMPLE— A SPINNING BLADE, RIGHT?

Circular saws might all look similar, but they vary in significant ways. Cutting capacity, for example, is mostly a factor of blade size, but can differ slightly among saws. When choosing the best saw, look for these features, which improve safety, make the saw more versatile or stand up better to the rigors of the job site:

- An electric brake stops the blade as soon as you release the saw's trigger.
- MAGNESIUM SHOE: Magnesium is lighter and stronger than steel.
- Some blade guards catch on the edge of your material, which is annoying and also unsafe. A blade guard shaped to avoid snagging the edge of a board means you don't have to lift it to make your cut. Keeping safety features in place is always a good thing.
- This feature makes it easy to change the bevel angle from 90 degrees to 45, or other common angles, with speed and consistency.



PREVENT SCRATCHES AND CHIP-OUT

Apply tape to the material you're cutting. This accomplishes three things: It prevents the saw's shoe from scuffing your wood, allows you to make an accurate and visible (dark) mark you won't have to sand away, and helps prevent chip-out.



CUT ANGLES EASIER

Cutting angles can be tricky because the blade guard often catches on the material as the saw begins to cut, even with a no-catch blade guard. Before starting the cut, lift the blade guard lever with your opposite hand until the blade guard can rest on the material.






MAKE A NOTCH

Mark the width and depth of your notch, then set the saw's depth and make several cuts between your marks. Knock away what's left with a screwdriver or chisel.

If the notch is less than 1-1/2 in. wide, use your circular saw to smooth out the bottom by slowly dragging the saw blade over the notch sideways. If the saw's shoe can't be supported on both sides of the blade, smooth out the bottom with a chisel.





USE A SPEED SQUARE GUIDE

To quickly make square cuts, use a Speed square as a saw guide. You'll get a perfect cut, fast. Be sure to place your square and the bulk of the saw on the keeper side of the board and line up the blade so it cuts on the scrap side of the board. If necessary, adjust the saw's blade depth to prevent the motor from hitting the square.

SCORE FOR A CLEAN CUT

A saw blade tends to lift the surface wood fibers as it cuts. giving you a fuzzy or splintered edge. Score your cutting line with a razor blade to cut the fibers on top and give you a clean edge.



MAKE STRAIGHT CUTS

A veteran carpenter once suggested I unwrap my thumb from the saw's handle and align my wrist and thumb with the direction I'm pushing the saw. When I changed my grip, I was able to make much straighter cuts without the aid of a saw guide.

PRO TIP

For straighter cuts, watch the blade cut along your line, instead of focusing on the saw's guide.



PROP THE BOARD

When making cuts on a pile of lumber or on a flat work surface, prop up the piece you're cutting with a small scrap about 2 in. long. It prevents you from cutting into the work surface and will allow the cutoff piece to fall away from the blade. Make your cut on the high side of the prop.

TROUBLE CUTTING STRAIGHT? CHECK THE SHOF

If you're having trouble with your saw not cutting straight along a guide, and leaving burn marks, check that the edge of the shoe is parallel to the blade. The shoe can bend and become crooked if your saw has been dropped or jostled too much. It might be time for a new saw or to find a replacement shoe online.



MAKE STEEP BEVEL CUTS

Most circular saws will make bevel cuts up to 55 degrees. What if you need a steeper bevel? Subtract the bevel you're after from 90 and set your saw at that bevel. Next, clamp or screw a block even with the end of the board to support the saw base while you cut. If the blade doesn't complete the cut, finish it with a handsaw or reciprocating saw. This trick works for compound cuts as well. Cut the angle first with the saw's bevel at 90 degrees, and then use the off-cut to support the saw while you cut the steep bevel.



CUT AND ROLL THROUGH POSTS

Even though the cutting capacity for traditional 7-1/4-in. circular saws is only about 2-1/2 in., you can easily cut through thicker posts. Mark the cut and make the first full-depth cut on one side, then roll the material backward and use the saw kerf to line up the next cut. A third roll and cut will saw through a 4x4 post. If you're working with larger lumber such as 6x6 posts, you'll have to cut on all four sides and finish it off with a handsaw or reciprocating saw.





CHECK FOR 90 DEGREES


If the blade on your circular saw isn't 90 degrees against its shoe. any bevel you adjust to will be inaccurate. Check the blade with a machinist's square. If it's not square, flip the saw upside down and adjust the setscrew on the bottom until it is square. Once the saw is dialed in at 90 degrees, adjust it to 45 degrees and check the angle with a Speed or combination square. Unplug the saw or remove its battery when making such adjustments.

UPGRADE WITH A DIY TRACK GUIDE

A simple and inexpensive track guide will let you cut straight, accurate lines with any circular saw. The track consists of a straight board fastened with glue and nails to a piece of 1/4-in. hardboard. Use the board as a fence and run the saw along the track, cutting the hardboard to match your saw blade exactly. Then to make a cut, just line up the edge of the guide with your marks. Making one long and one short version of this guide will give you a rip guide and a crosscut guide.

ALL BLADES ARE THE SAME, RIGHT?

A saw blade is more than its teeth. I prefer laser-cut blades with vibration-dampening slots cut into the blade body. Here's why: Blades with these slots cut cleaner and quieter. Blades without vibration-dampening slots are loud. This vibration makes your saw ring like a bell.

SHOPPING FOR SAW BLADES

Home centers stock many mid-level construction blades. If you're looking for a high-end woodworking blade, find your way to a specialty woodworking store like Rockler or Woodcraft. The experts at these stores will help you find what you're looking for.

TABLE SAW BLADES


combination blade for the table saw is perfect for the casual user. It produces clean crosscuts in solid wood or plywood, and rips plywood with acceptable results. Most combo blades expose their weakness when ripping thick lumber; the gullets are too small to effectively eject chips and keep the blade cool.






THIN KERF VS. STANDARD KERF

hich type should you buy? The correct answer is determined by the power of your saw. My rule of thumb is to use a thinkerf blade for any table saw under 3 hp, which includes all portable job-site saws. A thinkerf blade is 25% thinner than standard kerf, therefore it has 25% less cutting resistance. With a thin-kerf blade installed, your job-site saw will feel like a powerhouse.


Then I first used my father's circular saw, the cheap stamped steel blade smoked and burned, and also disappointed. Blades like this are still made—for some reason. You can spot them easily, but there is no reason to ever use them. A high-quality carbide-tipped circular saw blade costs only about \$15; it will cut cleaner and won't burn your wood.

on't cut metal with that nice crosscut blade! Sure, it might cut, but metal will damage the teeth. Blades for cutting nonferrous metals are designed for that work. With a negative hook angle, the teeth don't flare out to the sides. Before cutting metal, invest in a blade made for that purpose and save your wood blade for wood.

YOUR BLADE ISN'T DULL

t's dirty. And if you keep cutting with a dirty blade, it's going to get dull—fast! Cleaning the teeth regularly will keep the blade sharper longer. Make a habit of cleaning your blades immediately after use. You can easily remove any pitch buildup. and the next time you reach for that blade, it will be ready to go.

HOOK ANGLE EXPLAINED

POSITIVE RAKE ANGLE FOR TABLE SAWS

Positive rake angle on the table saw not only produces a better cut, but is safer, too.

POSITIVE OR NEUTRAL FOR MITER SAWS

Stationary miter saws can safely accept any hook angle; the blade is not moving in relationship to the work, so the material being cut can dictate the rake angle.

NEGATIVE HOOK ANGLE FOR SLIDING SAWS

Taking the crosscut blade off your table saw and putting it on the sliding miter saw could have dangerous consequences. Have you ever had a piece of wood jump out of your hands on a sliding miter saw? It might be because you're using the wrong blade. Sliding miter saws and radial arm saws require a blade with negative hook angle. As the blade spins, the teeth will push the part down and into the fence rather than catching it and pulling it up.

buying a chain saw? Consider a batterypowered one. While these saws can't go toe-to-toe with gaspowered chain saws when it comes to run-time and power, they'll do the job for most homeowners. And for many people, their advantages—no hard-to-start two-cycle engine, no mixing gas and oil, and no fouled spark plugs—make up for any shortcomings. We put a few models through their paces to find out what you can expect from a battery-powered chain saw. Here's what we found out.

WHAT WE LOOKED FOR

RUN-TIME We tested run-time two ways. First, by cutting through a 16-in.-diameter log. That's a tough slog; so many teeth carving at the same time draws a lot of battery power. Second, by cutting through 8-in. logs—work that's more typical for the average homeowner.

CHARGING TIME As you'll see, most battery chargers won't keep up with a saw's run-time. For any battery-powered saw, you'll want an extra battery (or two) if your work requires more than just trimming a few branches. Extra batteries are essential for chain saw work that's away from home and your plugged-in charger.

SPECS & FEATURES Criteria included bar length; weight; whether they feature a hand-guard/chain brake, bucking spikes and tool-free chain adjustment; and the ease of locating replacement chains.

■ Protect your hands with gloves containing fibers that stop chains.

sures you should take.

■ Protect your feet with steel- or composite-toe boots.

■ Battery-powered chain saws are quieter than their gas-powered counterparts, but they're still noisy. Wear hearing protection.

■ Protect your eyes and face from flying wood chips with a minimum of safety glasses. A full face shield is better.

■ Protect your legs with chaps woven with fibers that will stop a chain.

■ If you're cutting branches or limbs overhead, wear a hard hat. Hard hat/face shield/earmuff combos are readily available.

he battery run-time for these saws surprised me—I had expected it to be longer. But for our test, we cut continuously, with the trigger held down the whole time. A more typical scenario for a homeowner might be limbing a downed tree, for example. In that case, nine (or even four) minutes of actual cutting time takes off a lot of limbs in brief cuts. An extra battery doubles your cutting time. For some avid users, the run-time might be a deal breaker.

Also, when we cut the 16-in. logs, the air temperature was 32 degrees F, which I thought might affect battery life. So, to cut the 8-in. logs, I brought them into a heated shop to take temperature out of the equation. The differences were marginal.

For the amount of chain sawing I do, I'd still opt for battery over gas.

But which saw is best? For me, the Makita stood out as having a comparatively long running time and light weight, and the saw cut quickly and aggressively. It has a balanced feel and metal bucking spikes that protrude well beyond its housing. Bucking spikes poke slightly into the bark during the cut, giving you a solid fulcrum to tip the bar into the cut. This eases the work and makes it safer as well.

Makita's tool-free chain tension adjustment—a feature three of the saws have—is really nice as well. The Worx and Greenworks were excellent performers with nice price tags. All said and done, the six saws work well, so weigh the factors that are important to you.

Evolution favors reliable tool technology that helps us do better work. Juicing tools with electricity—whether cordless or tethered—has never been the main goal. It's about helping users get work done more easily. Today's progression is mostly about cordless tools and battery power. "We can simplify workplaces by moving to batteries and away from power cords, air hoses and gas," says Gabriel Sandoval, director of product management for Ryobi Tools.

That was the goal of NASA when it contracted with Black & Decker in the early '60s to make battery-powered tools—hammer drills and wrenches—that astronauts could use in outer space. The power wrench needed to spin bolts in zero gravity but not spin the astronaut holding the tool. The goal was simplicity and usability, not power.

THE ROAD TO LITHIUM-ION

That cordless space wrench used a nickel cadmium (NiCad) battery pack. Developed by a Swedish scientist in 1899, NiCad batteries had several advantages over lead-acid batteries—durability, long life and high energy density—and we continue to buy them as rechargeable AA, AAA and other cell sizes. However, these batteries suffer from

memory effect, where the cells will remember a lower energy capacity if you recharge them from a partial discharge state. (LSD) construction,

and environmental hazard.

Nickel metal hydride (NiMH), in use since the mid-1980s, delivered an even higher energy density than NiCad batteries and used no toxic cadmium or lead.

The problem with NiMH was, and still is, their self-discharge rate.

Leave a charged NiMH battery in a drawer or tool bag and it's likely to lose its charge; how's that for usability? Some newer NiMH battery cells are manufactured with low self discharge

In addition, cadmium is a toxin

overall voltage output.

That is how we got to lithium-ion batteries. High energy density, no toxicity, no memory effect, a low self-discharge rate and an overall higher usability. Yes, Li-ion battery cells are more expensive than NiCad and NiMH, but the benefits outweigh the cost difference. Li-ion cells are preferred by nearly every tool manufacturer, as well as by some auto makers.

BUILT FOR (SOME) ABUSE

Tools endure heat and cold, they vibrate and spin, and they're tossed around on job sites and in your shop. Is your battery pack tough enough for how you work? Some manufacturers share details of a product's construction. In the battery pack, thin and light conductive materials connect cells to an intricate circuit

board and the terminals that touch the tool.

The tool itself has terminals and wires that lead to a motor enabling your sanding, drilling, sawing and more. Consider all that next time you drop a tool, throw one into your pickup bed or use a drill battery as a hammer (you know you've done that).

A BATTERY IS A COLLECTION OF CELLS

he battery packs on cordless tools look alike for a reason: Most of them hold rows of similar cylindrical cells. The new DeWalt Power Stack battery uses Li-ion pouches (see below), not cylinders. But most toolmakers choose cylindershaped cells because they're the most cost effective.

Li-ion cylinders are manufactured in different sizes, and toolmakers generally use the "18650" size, though some are choosing the newer "21700" size. The first two numbers tell the diameter of the cylinder in millimeters. The next two numbers tell the length (or height); the final

"0" denotes the cylinder shape. Tesla, with its Gigafactory partner Panasonic, developed the "21700" cell in 2018. Its advantage? Higher energy density. But it comes at a cost in size and weight, which can make your tools heavier. Tesla recently developed a "4680" cell (much fatter, a little taller), claiming that it has greater storage capacity and costs less to build.

In the 18V battery pack on your cordless circular saw, five Li-ion cylinders, whether "18650" or "21700," lie neatly next to each other. Some 40V or 60V batteries

"18650" lithium-ion cells from a Ryobi battery pack for your lawn mower and the smaller 12V battery on your compact drill/driver have cells in groups of three or four. The 24V battery packs use groups of six cells. And the 2019 Tesla

DESIGN

s battery packs evolve, we see slight but important design updates. When Bosch built its Core 18V packs with the "21700" cells, for example, it arranged them in a wave design of sorts, not a flat layer of five cells. This enabled a slightly shorter but thicker pack design and gave more space for cool air to flow around the cells. Bosch claims this "cools the battery 17% faster and provides 135% longer life" when compared

with Bosch batteries without "CoolPack 2.0 technology."

DeWalt can take a different design direction with its new Power Stack battery technology. The use of lithium-ion pouch cells instead of cylindrical cells "represents the next step forward for our industry," says Sean Fitzgibbons, DeWalt's group product manager. Does he think cylinder cells will go away? "I think it will happen gradually in time. Not since we changed from NiCad to lithium-ion have we seen such a change in

results/performance." He points, for one, to the large, laser-welded connective tabs on the pouch cells that improve the electrical connection and, therefore, performance.

Toolmakers know that design is about performance, and they listen to tool owners. Ridgid dropped its Octane line of batteries last year following user feedback. "Octane was big and heavy," said Ridgid's Stewart, "and we want to move away from that, based on end-user feedback. Users told us they want smaller with the same performance."

While the future of battery design will bring big changes sooner rather than later, what's most important in the design realm is to "keep the compatibility and keep it affordable," says Ryobi's Sandoval.


BATTERIES & TOOLS IN USE

e disassembled a Ryobi 18V 2Ah battery and found five "18650" cells. Wired in series, those 3.6V cells combine energy to reach the nominal 18V rating. Had they been wired in parallel, the battery pack would be rated at 3.6V and 10Ah, not usable in shop tools.

Actual battery pack construction uses series wiring, or a combination of series and parallel cell connections. For example, to achieve an 18V 4Ah battery pack, a toolmaker adds a second layer of five "18650" (3.6V, 2Ah) cells, with each of the two fivecell groups wired in series and then wired in parallel. Ryobi's 18V 6Ah is noticeably taller, with three layers of five-cell groups inside.

Bosch is one of a few tool manufacturers using the higher-Ah "21700" cells in its battery packs. Its Core 18V 4Ah battery uses a single layer of five "21700" cells in a pack that is noticeably smaller than competitors' 4Ah battery packs using two layers of "18650" cells (see the weight chart below). While Bosch announces "21700 cell technology" on its website, Milwaukee marketing materials don't, even though many of its M18 batteries use "21700" cells.

So how do you know which battery cells are inside each battery pack? Amp hours. Milwaukee's M18 line includes an 18V 3Ah battery pack stamped with Milwaukee's "High Output" badging; it's powered by "21700" cells. There is also an M18 pack with the same 18V 3Ah rating, but its much larger size tells the inside story of two layers of "18650" battery cells. With twice as many cells, that non-High Output battery pack weighs nearly 1 lb.



more than the High Output battery. Less weight and equal power mean the advantage goes to the battery pack using "21700" cells.

But even though the cells and their numbers are important, they're not the whole story.

DEFINITIONS & A LITTLE MATH

Voltage is the maximum potential energy of a battery cell or group of cells. It's the amount of energy provided to the electric circuit that spins your drill. Each of the "18650" and the "21700" cells inside a tool's battery pack has a nominal voltage of 3.6 (some might say 3.7, but 3.6 is the norm).

When you connect five 3.6V cells (wired in series),

you get an 18V battery (5 x 3.6 = 18). Tool manufac-

turers that stamp a tool with "20V Max" are referring to the battery's maximum *initial* voltage. A cell reaches maximum voltage when fully charged, but then it quickly settles to its *nominal* voltage

for the remainder of its

charged cycle. That's the difference between nominal voltage of a cell (3.6V) and maximum voltage (4V).

Most makers that go with the "maximum" voltage place an asterisk after 12V or 20V on their tools and in literature. DeWalt, for example, says, "*Maximum initial battery voltage (measured without a workload) is 20 volts. Nominal voltage is 18." A 12V battery uses three 3.6V cells for a total nominal voltage of 10.8 and max of 12. Manufacturers in European countries are required to use the nominal voltage in labeling.

"It is all about the platform," says Ridgid's Stewart—and he means for both the user and the manufacturer. Tool users who own a half-dozen of a single brand of tools might need just three batteries and one charger. That saves money and shop space. Manufacturers that build a complete line of tools to all work with the same battery are more likely to build brand loyalty. Makita claims it makes more than 270 tools that work with its 18V battery (though some tools need two batteries). Ryobi's One+ tool lineup now includes more than 260 tools.

Choosing one tool brand does place your future purchases into one voltage category, but you won't be limited to one amp-hour option. That means you can use an 8Ah battery in your circular saw if you're cutting stacks of framing lumber or ripping heavy sheet goods. Or you can use the 2Ah battery when you want a lighterweight tool and you have access to a charger and a backup battery.

"Your tool platform choice is dependent on many factors," says Christopher Gregory, Bosch product marketing manager, "including tool usage, power needs, runtime and application."

Most of the brands know you want to keep your tools for years. The DeWalt drill/driver with 20V 2Ah battery I purchased nearly four years ago still works well, so I was thrilled to learn that a brand new 20V 5Ah battery will also work with that same old drill. And my old battery works with new tools! As battery and tool tech evolve, I hope old and new continue to work together.

WHAT'S AN AMP-HOUR?

mp (short for "ampere") is a measure of current flow, and amp-hour is that flow over time. A battery's amp-hour (Ah) rating tells the amount of energy charge that allows one amp of current to flow for one hour. For example, an 18V 4Ah battery will supply one amp at 18V for four hours, or two amps for two hours, or the current needed for as long as it can.

Battery cells have individual Ah ratings as well as V ratings. And this is where the "21700" cells step away from the smaller "18650" cells. While most tool manufacturers don't announce if their battery packs use "18650" or "21700" cells, the battery's Ah rating can tell the story. The

"18650" cells are generally rated from 1.5Ah to 2.5Ah. The larger "21700" cells have a higher cell capacity and increased energy density, which leads to high Ah ratings, from 3.0 to nearly 5.0. And that means longer run-time for your tools.



tery pack available, but that's not what most DIYers need. Start by purchasing a kit that includes α tool, like α drill/ driver, with an included battery and charger. From there, buy bare tools and batteries separately, always making sure there is a lifetime service agreement available.

Shop for batteries by first considering your power needs, and then the price. If your cordless work is mostly in remote locations where you can't easily access freshly charged batteries, then go for the packs with the high amp-hour ratings. But if you're working near home with the convenience of battery chargers, then choose low-Ah batteries. They're smaller, lighter and cost less.

HOW CAN I MAKE THE MOST OF BATTERY/TOOL LIFE?

- Avoid temperature extremes. like over 100 or below zero degrees F.
- Avoid vibration and jarring. Don't use your battery as a hammer, and don't toss one into a tool bag or truck bed.
- Moisture is bad; keep your batteries dry as much as possible.
- Read the owner's manual and follow charging recommendations.
- Leave batteries on the charger when they're not in use.
- If a lifetime service agreement is available, use it!
- Do not run batteries down completely; it's better to charge them at the first sign of power loss.
- Let batteries return to room temp before charging.
- Use only original-equipment batteries designed for your tool, not aftermarket batteries.

ONE OF A GRIN RELIEF CARVING— WITH POWER!

BY MIKE BERNER

n angle grinder is a simple, affordable and endlessly versatile tool. With the right attachment, you can grind, cut or polish metal, masonry and stone. You can also quickly sand wood, cut tile and clean away rust from metal.

I recently discovered a new attachment for my grinder: power-carving wheels. With these new wheels, I can shape wood and create reliefs and contours with ease. I had a rough slab of cherry that seemed unusable and was headed for a campfire. It was perfect for a power-carving test run. After a dusty day of carving, I ended up with a unique piece of art.

TAKE SAFETY SERIOUSLY

The angle grinder is a handheld tool that spins at 10,000 rpm or more. When a spinning carving wheel hits the wood, the dust and wood chips will fly everywhere. A face shield is a must, and I prefer to add safety goggles and a long-sleeved shirt. Because my hands are so close to the wheel, I always wear gloves and keep the side handle in place. Clamp down your workpiece and make sure the chips are flying away from anything they can harm.



DRAW THE CONTOURS

To make my design (see Photo 6), I began by drawing lines to indicate the highest contour—the peaks. I followed the grain but also deviated from it to create interesting crossing patterns. Sketch your lines with a pencil, and then once you like the shapes, go over them with a white china pencil.

DEFINE THE DEPTH To establish a consistent depth for the valleys, I drilled holes every few inches between my lines. I marked the depth with a tape flag on a 1/4-in. drill bit before drilling. You can skip this step if a consistent depth isn't important.

SHAPE THE CONTOURS Using a coarse-grit carving wheel, I removed material between the lines, carving until the 1/4-in. holes disappeared. I started in the middle of the valleys and carved slopes toward the peak lines. Once I removed most of the material, I switched to a medium grit, and then finished with a fine-grit carving wheel.

Available in similar grits and many shapes, these 1/8-in.-shank burrs allow you to shape details in smaller crevices. The burrs fit into many rotary tools and are especially easy to use in rotary tools that have a flexible shaft.

SAND IT SMOOTH

I sanded this piece with 80-grit through 180-grit sandpaper, using an orbital sander where it would fit and then switching to sanding sponges to follow the contours. Depending on the look you're after, sanding could be the slowest, most labor-intensive part of the project.

7 ATTACH MITER SLIDERS TO THE SLED

Miter sliders are available in a range of styles—even homemade strips of solid wood cut to fit the miter slot. I used solid steel miter sliders made by Incra (\$28 each). They won't bend, and a tab on their leading edge keeps the sled from tipping out of the miter slots.

GLUE THE BRIDGE TO THE SLED BASE

Use thick CA glue with accelerator to attach the bridge to the sled base. It doesn't have to be perfectly straight or square; it's there simply to keep the two halves of the sled together.

MAKE THE KERF With the blade completely elevated, run the sled

through the saw until the blade is 2 in. away from the back edge.

TALIGN THE FENCE TO THE BLADE

With the sled still on the saw, place the try square against the blade to align the fence to the saw, then glue the fence to the base. I used slow CA glue to give me time to make minor adjustments. When the glue is dry, secure the bridge and fence with countersunk 1-1/4-in. screws driven from the bottom.

ATTACH THE T-TRACK TO THE FENCE

Cut the T-track to length and align it to the face of the fence. Attach the track with 1-in. No. 6 wood screws.

SEAL EVERYTHING WITH SHELLAC

To stabilize and protect the wood, use your favorite topcoat to seal the entire sled. I used shellac because it dries fast and looks great.










ou don't need industrial-sized machinery to plane large pieces of wood. A full-size router with a 1/2-in. collet, a large-diameter bit and a simple jig will do the trick. The process will take a little longer than it would with a big machine, but the results will be just as good.



TOOLS & MATERIALS

Full-size router with 1/2-in. collet, 2-in.-diameter bottoming bit, 4 x 8-ft. sheet of 3/4-in. MDF

BIT FOR PLANING

You'll need a large-diameter router bit to speed the process along. If you have a router and a collection of bits, you might already have what you need. The bit doesn't need to be purpose-made for planing. It just needs to cut a flat surface. I used the bit shown at left that came with a door-making kit.



Start with a piece of 3/4-in. MDF that's about 6 in. larger than your workpiece, in both length and width. Build up two rails to support the gantry using 2-in.-wide strips of 3/4-in. MDF. Just stack these, tacking them in place with screws or brad nails. That allows to easily remove them as you decrease the thickness of your workpiece.

BUILD THE GANTRY

Construct the gantry as shown, using 3/4-in. MDF. Its length depends on the distance between the rails of your platform. The gantry should be just long enough to allow the overhanging keepers to slide freely along the rails.

SECURE THE WORKPIECE Wedge shims underneath your stock to keep it from teetering while you're routing. Use 3/4-in. MDF blocking screwed to the platform to keep the stock from sliding.

FLATTEN THE WORKPIECE Set your router's depth to remove 1/8 to 1/4 in. of material. Slide the router through the gantry, then move the gantry over a distance slightly less than the diameter of your bit and slide the router through the gantry again. This first pass may only remove a few high spots.

After cutting everything to that depth, lower the bit another 1/8 in. to 1/4 in. and proceed as above until the whole side is flattened. Then flip the workpiece over and repeat on the other side. I couldn't get enough depth for cutting with my router's dust port attached, so I had to go without. This is very dusty work, so wear a mask!

FINISH YOUR PROJECT After flattening, sand your project and apply the finish. I attached hairpin legs to turn this crosscut into a coffee table.

INSPECT THE SPARK PLUG DIODE

1. CLEAN AND REUSE

If the spark plug looks slightly brown—not too dark—simply clean it with a soft wire brush, check the gap and reinstall.


2. REPLACE

Once your spark plug gets to this point—with an oil-fouled and deteriorated electrode—it

needs to be replaced. A new spark plug costs less than \$10 and will create the right spark to best ignite the fuel/air mix in the combustion chamber.



Small engines need clean air. A clean air filter allows maximum airflow and the optimum fuel/ air mixture. You can and should clean the air filter. If the air filter is too far gone or if it's made of paper and it's cloqued, it needs to be replaced.





ALWAYS USE NEW GAS

Small engines love fresh fuel. If you have a can of gas that has been sitting around for more than four months, recycle that old gas. Ethanol blends have an even shorter life. Through oxidation and evaporation, gasoline becomes less combustible, leading to poor performance, rough idling and varnish deposits.

AVOID ETHANOL BLENDS

Small engines prefer ethanolfree gas. Ethanol attracts moisture from the air, separates from the gas and sinks to the bottom of the tank. This can cause ignition problems. But that's not the worst of it—ethanol is also corrosive and burns very hot, which can cause overheating and severe engine damage.

SOMETHING I LEARNED WAS...


Never add fuel stabilizer to old gas—stabilizer won't bring gas back to life. Add stabilizer only to fresh gas to extend its use.

CARBURETOR **TOO FAR GONE? BUY NEW!**

If your carburetor has reached the point of no return, finding a new replacement online is easy. Dave says Amazon and eBay are great places to start looking.

CLEAN/REBUILD THE CARB

We've all done it—delayed fall maintenance until spring. The engine might fire up, but it won't stay running for long. It's time to disassemble and clean the carburetor.

Preserved to the carburetor.

REMOVE THE CARBURETOR

Disconnect the fuel line, and if there is still fuel in the tank, crimp the line to avoid leaks. Most of the time, you'll find two bolts holding the carburetor to the engine. Remove these bolts and the carburetor.

After removing the main jet and the float bowl, Dave pokes out the float hinge pin with a nail set. Take the float off with care; the inlet needle and spring clip are under the float and are easy to lose.

A dirty idle jet is the reason small engines pulse and surge instead of idling smoothly. It's also easy to overlook. On this carburetor, the idle jet is behind a small plastic cap. Dave uses an old dental pick to pop out the cap and then removes the idle jet with a small flat-head screwdriver.

Soak the parts in Berryman Chem-Dip cleaner (\$30 per gallon) for 15 minutes. This takes care of most surface grime. After soaking, use a brush to clean off any remaining debris.






DEEP CLEANING A deep clean removes debris not reachable by soaking. Dave uses an ultrasonic cleaner,

but you can place parts in a pot of boiling water for 15 minutes.

CLEAN THE NEEDLE SEAT To make sure the needle seats

cleanly, use a cotton swab to clear debris out of the needle seat.

REASSEMBLE AND INSTALL Lay the clean parts out on your bench and do one final inspection. Reassemble the carburetor, bolt it to your machine and don't forget to prime it!



RULES FOR SEASONAL STORAGE

DRAIN THE CARBURETOR

You need to take one more important step after running your small engine out of fuel for the season. Some gas will remain in the carburetor's float bowl, and you need to drain it completely. Many carburetors have a small drain plug on the bottom of the float bowl for this purpose. If left to sit, the gas will varnish and you'll need to remove the carburetor to clean it.

DON'T WINTERIZE—EXERCISE

Perhaps the easiest way to avoid the downside of seasonal maintenance tasks is to "exercise" your engine. Instead of draining the engine of all gas, keep the fuel tank full in the off-season and run the engine once a month for about 10 minutes. Dave has used this technique for years; it saves him time and provides peace of mind. He knows his small engines always have good gas and the internal workings are always coated in fresh oil. Seems like a no-brainer.

CHANGE THE OIL

Change the oil in your small engine every season. Fresh, clean oil keeps sludge from building up and helps maintain good compression.



PRO TIP:

Some lawn mowers don't have an oil drain plug; the oil is drained out of the fill tube at the top of the engine. Before you tip over your lawn mower to drain the oil, unscrew the gas cap and stretch plastic over the gas tank opening, then screw the cap back on. The plastic will prevent gas from leaking out the cap vent.

TREATING COMMON INJURIES

In spite of all your precautions, you may still injure yourself. Assess the situation, evaluate the injury and call 911 if necessary. Here's how to treat a few common DIY injuries:

SPLINTERS

Clean the area with soap and warm water, and use tweezers to pull the splinter out at the same angle it went in. According to the American College of Emergency Physicians, if it's deeply embedded, over a joint or difficult to remove, leave it in place and get medical help.

SMALL LACERATIONS

Here's how to handle small saw or knife cuts. If the wound is dirty, gently rinse it under running water or use antiseptic wipes. To control bleeding from small cuts, raise and support the injured part and apply pressure. Dry it and apply a sterile bandage. Be sure your tetanus vaccination is up to date.

NAIL PUNCTURE WOUNDS

Stepping on a nail is undeniably painful, and it poses a high risk of infection because dirt and germs can be driven deep into your foot. Wash your hands and apply gentle pressure to stop any bleeding. Rinse the injury for 5 to 10 minutes, apply an antibiotic and bandage the wound. Seek medical attention if the wound was dirty or the puncture is deep—you may require a tetanus booster. If the wound is healing slowly or you notice any signs of infection-including pain, pus, swelling or fever—see a doctor promptly.

A KIT BUILT FOR BUILDERS

Every household needs a well-stocked first aid kit, and it's especially critical for DIYers. We recently checked out the Construction Medic Mini first aid kit (\$100 at mymedic.com). It contains more than 45 vital first aid supplies, several of which treat acute injuries that power tool users are more prone to. There's a chest seal to treat penetrating injuries to the chest, an easy-to-use tourniquet and even a finger tourniquet to stop the bleeding if you sever a digit. The compact kit is small enough to keep in your toolbox, and a full-size Construction Medic Pro (\$375) is also available.





No matter which first aid kit you choose for your household, be sure to keep it current. You don't want to injure yourself and discover that your bandages are brittle, the medications have expired and the antiseptic wipes have long since dried up. Stay safe—we really do care about you.



FIX THAT TABLE LEG

With one of its legs broken, this old side table teetered and shook. The break was mostly clean, but the previous repair work was poorly done, so it was time to fix the leg properly. Jay Cork shows how he did it.



REMOVE THE OLD GLUE A previous repair—done poorly—left glue that needed to be removed. Gently remove the broken wood from the table base and carefully clean off the old glue residue with a chisel.



APPLY GLUE, AND HOLD Apply a small amount of 15-minute epoxy to both sides of the repair, working it into the grain. I couldn't clamp this, so I held the two parts together until the epoxy set up.



MATCH THE FINISH Rub on gel stain and feather the color; it will hide the repair. Go slow and let it fully dry between coats. Once the color is blended, apply a coat of satin urethane to even out the sheen.





THE BATHROOM IS OCCUPIED



FUZZY TROUBLE-SHOOTING
