



### **EVEN CHANGE IS CHANGING**

Fluxus art involved the viewer, relying on the element of chance to shape the ultimate outcome of the piece. The use of chance was also employed by Dada, Marcel Duchamp, and other performance art of the time, such as Happenings. Fluxus artists were most heavily influenced by the ideas of John Cage, who believed that one should embark on a piece without having a conception of the eventual end. It was the process of creating that was important, not the finished product.

The MoOD inspiration book was given the name Fluxus because of the metaphoric resemblance to our current times. Today's world, with its seven billion inhabitants, also stands on the verge of big and essential changes. The purifying flow, which literally flushes the old economic mind-set, is merely one signal the change is actually started. We currently find ourselves in a transitional space, which will determine the future of the textile industry.



IF Finesse by VD Werkstätten is no ordinary panel product. Made by pressing layered veneers onto ply or MDF at temperatures of up to 160°C with more than 1300 kilos per square metre of pressure, the rich surface texture of Ocean, Mosaik, Sisal, Wave, Spalt and Split - the five options now stocked by James Latham - cries out to be touched. Finesse possesses depth to rival that of sea-worn pier timbers and mediaeval wood-framed houses, though its uses have included contemporary bars, shopfitting, modesty panels on swish office desks, feature panels in the foyers of grand hotels and fascias for upto-the-minute kitchens and bedrooms.

"Although we use oak, walnut and lacquerable white foils for some of our products, many of our panels are made with Alpi man-made veneers," comments VDW's sales manager, Joachim Pahmeyer. "The deep structure begins with two sheets on the face side and two as a balancer. For the deeper pressings, such as Borke (a development of Spalt), we use seven sheets of veneer. Our standard product comes in two sizes, 3100 x 1300mm and 2450 x 1050, and thicknesses of 18.5 or 21mm. Almost all our

products are available in horizontal and vertical grain and both options can be edgebanded easily. Often, designers choose a plywood substrate which doesn't need an edgebanding. It looks good if you chamfer the edge of the veneer."

In addition to veneer-finished boards, some paper and pvc foil finishes - including laminated and lacquered versions - are available on special order. Bubble, for example, uses a melamine-based, laquered foil and can be supplied matt or gloss, as required. Pluto is surfaced with hand-finished metal and sits right at the top of a range which extends to more than 20 current standard products and 10-12 older structures.


VDW also offers ready-made, cut-tosize components, including curved doors and modesty panels. By using honeycomb panels for larger components, the weight can also be reduced by as much as half. "If the volume is there," adds Joachim, "We will even make a special tool to create the exact finish required by the customer."





As perfect as the diapasons which front any cathedral organ, the ducting at Decorative Panels' new 175,000 square foot factory in Elland is only part of a prestigious extraction and filter installation by Cades.

# ive pipework

hen Decorative Panels commissioned Cades to design and install an extraction system for its new 175,000 square foot factory, Steve Rhodes, MD at Bradfordbased Cades, knew it would be a challenging project. "They wanted an extraction system that would run 24/7, would give the best energy savings possible and would be as automatic as possible," he recalls. "And they wanted to be able to start production in one part the factory whilst installation of the system was being completed in another." Remarkably, the first part of the system was ready for work as the first machine was installed back in February. Since then, more than 1,500 metres of ducting has been fitted and connected to a system which is capable of extracting 300,000 cubic metres per hour.

"We supplied two Moldow MHL filters which run 24/7," explains Steve. "It's a very robust, galvanised construction carriage cleaning system with negative pressure filter, so the fans are on the clean side. No woodwaste goes through the fans, so they don't wear so much and it's possible to use a more energy efficient fan. There are three fans per filter, all


inverter driven, three of 75kW and three of 90kW on the bigger filter. There's an automatic trailer feed system from each filter which takes the waste from the filter to the trailer." The system uses a reverse blow fan for cleaning. "It's more energy efficient than compressed air cleaning," says Steve. A Minimax fire system, which Decorative Panels ordered directly, has also been installed and the installation has been designed so it can be linked to a burner system without major alteration.

From the filter, there are 16 independent ducting runs serving individual machines to give better control over energy saving. "Basically, on start of a machine, the extraction system starts up automatically," explains Steve. "The Moldow Energy Manager detects signals from all machines, opens the appropriate damper and sets the fans going. The fans ramp up to the volume required for each particular machine. They only use enough air volume for the machines they are running. As the machines are switched off, or product stops feeding, the dampers close and the fans ramp down. That also brings a significant noise benefit."

At the end of every shift, the Moldow Energy Manager sends an email to the production manager which provides information on how much power has been consumed, how long the machines have been running, the status of the filter bags, etc. Operators don't have to do anything - the system automatically starts, stops and reports. "Getting the Moldow Energy Manager system to work with Decorative Panels' production was the trickiest part of the installation," recalls Steve. "It can be tailored to suit individual needs so it has to be tuned. Now it's up and running, it can be interrogated remotely from anywhere."



The vast array of equipment in the new factory means Decorative Panels can offer processing of melamine, PVC and ABS edgebands; direct postforming; sawing and edgebanding work with lightweight panels of up to 60mm in thickness; high speed, throughfeed drilling, complemented with point-to-point for complex bespoke panels; sawing of panels as thin as 2mm; routing, shaping, and so forth. "We can manufacture a full spectrum of panel types, boxing as well if required," adds Guy. "The packing line was commissioned on 21st June."

Prior to commissioning of the new factory, Decorative Panels Group always drew a clear line between its components business and its furniture business: if the product was palletised, it was a component; if it was boxed, it was furniture. In the new site, the fully automated packing line is of the same specification as that used in the furniture factory, so the components factory can support Decorative Panels' furniture factory. "But," says Guy, "It also means we can get back into products such as decorative shelving as well as being able to supply our customers with boxed items. We can also supply fascias and other components through the components factory."

It's been a long, hard journey, stripping out and refurbishing, planning and equipping the new 175,000 square foot factory in Elland and the gold medal they claimed at the grand opening on

22nd June 2012 was richly deserved. But long before the Decorative Panels team took its places on the podium (to jubilant fanfares from the massed bands of the Calder Valley), Decorative Panels Group and the team that made it all possible was already clutching silver and bronze. The first machines to be installed were producing as far back as February 2012, way before the main lines were anywhere close to completion. And by late April, the factory was up to 75% production.

So, with the ribbon cut and the gold medal gleaming in the cabinet, what does the future hold for Decorative Panels Group?

"We have a business which starts with sheet materials and we service many industries," says Guy Metcalfe. "A component is simply a sheet we've put a sawblade through. We have a 100 per cent flatpack furniture business; we produce only high volume flatpack and that side of our business is growing. We're also enjoying good export success, especially with our lamination business. The future is on all those fronts. We have some exciting developments coming up on the lamination front which will come to fruition next year. We're also putting a lot into our new marketing suite and the plans we have for that are mind-blowing. The future is potentially very exciting."

For the next 20 years, you could get paid for making green energy through the government's Renewable Heat Incentive but the RHI applies to the boiler, so you need to make sure it will last for 20 years.

s the pace of change increases year on year, how many companies would have the confidence to talk about an installation they carried out half a decade ago? Mawera has. And John Clissett, Mawera UK's MD, is confident that the equipment they supplied to BLP in Doncaster (which was acquired by BA Components a couple of years ago), will be working just as efficiently in another ten or fifteen years.

"When it was installed at BLP, it was the intention to burn 100-120 tonnes of MDF waste a week," recalls John. "The existing equipment had come to the end of its useful life. We replaced it with an FR3500, 3500kW boiler. Though regulations have changed, it still conforms with the emission requirements and heats the complete factory. It was a turnkey project including factory heating, process and office heating, the complete installation of the boiler and emissions equipment, together with planning information and calculation. We supplied everything from the feed system for the FR3500 to the dust abatement system

which cleans up the emissions prior to discharge. We've 30 years of experience of this kind of project in the UK."

The quality of the engineering in Mawera boilers, says John, is very high. They are designed to work and go on working without problems - and in the light of new developments, that's critical. Mawera has four different types of equipment to suit anything from a sawmill to an MDF factory - but offering the right kind of equipment is only part of the story. Keeping abreast of the ever-changing regulations is the big challenge. By knowing the system, Mawera could help you to acquire a new, modern factory heating system which could provide you with an income from your waste materials.

"The regulations changed in February," explains John. "The government is pushing hard for utilisation of recycled materials and renewable energy. Woodwaste is a big contender. The RHI - Renewable Heat Incentive means you get paid for making green energy from burning a biomass product like wood. It's a unique system

which applies only in England, Scotland and Wales. The government pays you for each kilowatt you produce. Any boiler installed after July 2009 can qualify for the feeding tariff and that's a huge incentive to install a new plant. As the incentive runs for 20 years and it's allocated to a particular installation, you need a piece of equipment which will last and perform for that 20 year period." Buy a boiler that's designed to last and you'll probably get the money from the heat meter back in ten years, John calculates. "Each area and each zone has to be individually tracked," he says, "Therefore, it's a theoretical calculation, but I'd expect it to be paid back twice in 20 years. There are different tariff levels for different sizes of boiler, so the bigger the boiler, the lower the tariff."

So how does it work?

"Buy, install and commission your boiler, get an independent consultant report, then make the application to OFGEM," says John. "OFGEM is controlling the application for RHI."



# milan magic

Despite some initial reservations about exhibiting at Xylexpo, Homag returned from Milan pleasantly surprised.

By their own admission the Homag Group went to Xylexpo with suppressed expectations. Difficult economic times in Italy and the controversy surrounding trade fair locations gave the company pause for thought. In the end, they came away from Milan pleasantly surprised - despite the fact that Italian woodworking companies were the ones driving the debate surrounding the trade fair location and the general feeling of economic dissatisfaction currently prevailing in Italy.

Although the proportion of international visitors was down, the company secured two major orders from Italy. A major Italian kitchen manufacturer placed an order for a Homag Batch Size 1 plant for edgebanding with recirculation plus a dividing centre from Weeks. A key Italian supply company invested in a Holzma sawing plant and a pre-coating plant using the Homag reacTec method.

Waste It, Save It Ltd has bought a top of the range Gross shredder from Gross UK to recycle waste wood into animal bedding. Company Directors Derrick Winspear and Tony Backhouse purchased the GAZ102 37kW shredder to convert wood waste into bedding for horses, rabbits, chickens etc.

After an internet search they contacted Kurt Cockcroft at Gross UK who helped them choose the right machine. The machine was installed by Gross and was soon up and running. Waste It, Save It receives wood free of charge from skip companies, it is hand sorted to remove MDF then shredded before being screened for metal particles and filtered to remove lingering dust. "I do not understand why wood companies continue to pay to have their wood removed when they can cost effectively

shred it to turn into briquettes for sale or can even burn it to save money on heating," says Tony Backhouse.

The company currently produces about 150 bags of bedding a week and plans to expand to around 600 plus a week. Next on the want list are an automatic tagging machine and a Gross briquette press.
