

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"We always ask customers what they are getting from their current supplier and what they could do differently," he says. "There is always something. But we don't go in and sell hard. We ask what they need, how often they buy, why they use that supplier, whether they get everything they need, whether they order in advance, whether they have to buy full rolls... It's about finding out what the need is.

"Sometimes there isn't a need and their supplier is great. If we can't improve on that, we'll leave a card so if they struggle to get something in the future, or they need a backup, we are there. Once they look through the catalogue and realise we can offer adhesives and cleaning products as well as edgebands that match all the main manufacturers of MFC and MFMDF – and we have a range of veneers and melamines as well – the enquiries start to trickle in.

We are becoming number one for a lot of companies now because we're not pushy."

In the last year, Simon and his team have won business from all corners of the industry but it's not just down to their approach. The advantages of Hranipex products are also being noticed, especially their ABS hot air range.

"One of our biggest advantages is our hot air ABS range, **AdvantEdge**, and we're particularly good at it," he says. "We introduced **AdvantEdge** two years ago with 14 décors. We now have over 170 décors in stock — and in the UK, we have around 50 décors in the warehouse for next day delivery. Our technology is patented. We apply a functional, post-extrusion layer so we can take any roll off the shelf, colour match it, apply a layer and send it to the customer with minimum order quantities of one roll.

"We had a customer last year who wanted a unique  $54 \times 1 \text{ mm}$  aubergine high gloss. We were able to extrude the high gloss, apply the functional layer and deliver it to him within a week. The technology is there."

One of the biggest sellers in the Hranipex range is adhesives and the company has its own formulations of EVA, PUR and PVAC. Hranipex PUR technology includes standard cartridges as well as own brand PUR mini cartridges, which are an alternative to granules. "They come in blister packs so you just open what you need to use, pop it in, melt it down and that's it," Simon explains – and it seems there is no shortage of mini cartridges.

"We have our own formulation of D3 PVA glue for laminate pressing. It is one of our biggest sellers. People are buying it by

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the IBC. Like everybody, the quantity we can get our hands on at the moment is limited but it is available."

Simon's confidence that he can win over customers large and small has been echoed by his bosses at Hranipex in the Czech Republic. Together, they've invested substantially in new, purpose-built offices and warehouse space that will take Hranipex UK to the next level and set it up for growth.

The new building, not a mile away from their old warehouse and office, is three times bigger: "We moved in during the second week of July and started trading from this site on 2nd August. We have additional floor space and the office space is bigger so we now have the capacity for growth. We have two empty desks but we will fill them next year. We've created a nicer working environment with natural light all day. We also have a meeting room, which is informal and suits the sales team much better, and a nice samples area with swatches of most of the décors we make on the wall."

The warehouse is the biggest change. The 12 aisles of racking Simon's warehouse team had at the old site have been extended upwards by two extra levels and six more racking systems have been added for fast-moving, high volume stored goods like Egger W980, Kronospan K101 and the ever-popular greys, blacks and whites. A vertical storage system provides easy access to part rolls and the packing area includes an extra rewind table so four rolls can be rewound at once to the lengths ordered by customers.

The whole IT system has been upgraded with new scanners and computers in the warehouse and that's in addition to a new pallet wrapping machine, two new pallet strapping machines and a waste baler for cardboard. The baler has been a Godsend









for recycling the cardboard containers that come from the factory when products are reboxed in a double-layered box with a cross-weave tape for transit in the UK. "It's great for our environmental policy," Simon confirms.

"We also have two new Combilift Aisle Master trucks, which increase the speed of operations in the warehouse. We can have one loading and the other picking, or two unloading at the same time."

The outside area is huge. The team can deal with two wagons at once. The 'goods in' bay can hold 50 pallets and the outbound can hold another 30."We had space at the

old site for just 15 pallets. That was it. We've only added one additional part-time member of staff but since March 2020, we've increased our daily outbound capacity by about 30-40%. Everything is quicker and the team works so well together. The new building has moved us to the next level. We can work much more efficiently.

"I can't stress enough how much we love what we do here. We work well as a team. We are a small, more approachable, more flexible manufacturer and we are just as happy to work with customers on specialist products as we are to supply half a million metres of white  $22 \times 0.45$ mm edge for

carcasssing. That's really what makes us different. That's what makes me enjoy what we're doing: the fact we really do have something extra to offer, something our customers know and appreciate."



The imaginative use of some very different materials from Ostermann enabled the creation of a striking and very practical interior for this jewellery shop.

hat is it that actually makes a good retail environment? An inviting flair? A recognisable design? A multitude of well-thought-out details? Whatever it is you need, you might be surprised to know that Ostermann's portfolio includes a broad range of products for furniture and wall design — and Ostermann was the supplier of choice for this strikingly simple yet very upmarket exclusive shop fit-out.

Take a closer look at the jewellery shop illustrated on these pages and you'll find some quite striking surfaces and furniture elements that mirror the exclusiveness and refinement of the merchandise.

The combination of white marble, matt gold and glass stand for refined taste and classic elegance. To create an atmosphere that put the focus firmly on the jewellery, a restricted colour and surface pallet was chosen for the furniture while indirect lighting from the mirrors and suspended ceiling added to the ambience.

For the sales tables and display cabinets, Ostermann supplied wooden boards with a white marble look and their matching "Carrara marble" edgings, giving the exhibits a calm and elegant setting. In keeping with the restrained room concept, the walls around the cabinet surfaces were clad with matching light marble décor boards from Sibu.

The matt-golden fronts of the presentation counters and wall cabinets add to the tasteful luxury of the shop interior. They were made using a Fenix NTA surface and the matching ABS edging, Alu Oro Cortez from Ostermann. The unique matt look and soft feel typify this genuine metal

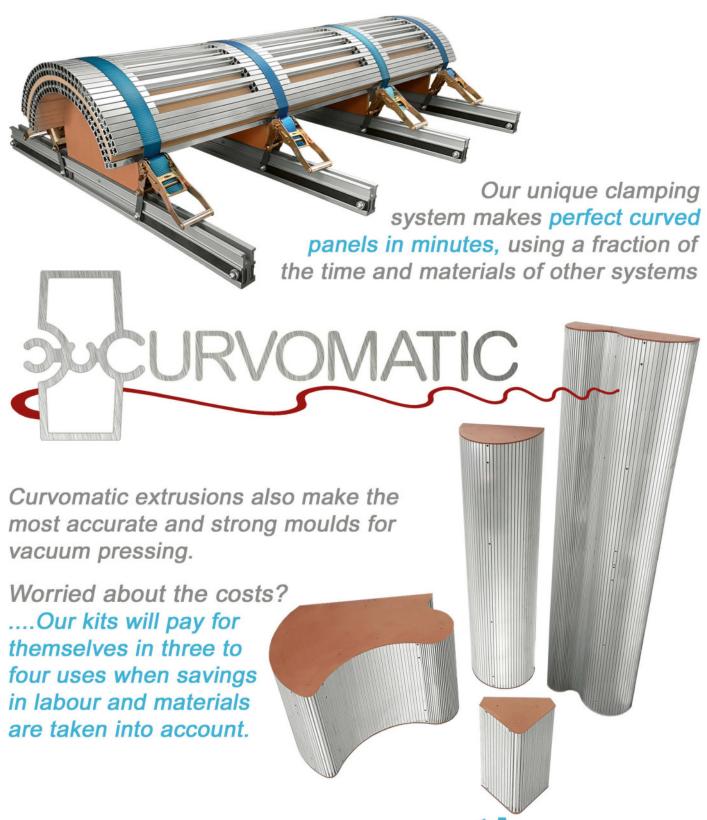
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finish. The exquisite design is rounded off by several mirror and glass surfaces.

For the drawers beneath the display cases, Ostermann supplied its popular aluminium handle, 'Salsa 1'. Delicate in its linear design, the matt black handle brings the golden fronts with their equally matt finish to the fore. The handle solution is available for many standard carcass widths from 295 mm to 1195 mm and if comes in a choice of four colours.

Sub Line 3 LED profiles were attached to the right and left of the mirrors. Ostermann's matching ECOflex LED strip works perfectly here. The high quality aluminium profiles with a matt plastic cover are ideal for the background and accent the lighting of furnishings and protect the LED strip from

dust and moisture. They are available with two different cover versions, opal and black.

Most jewellers like to present their expensive rings, necklaces and brand mark watches on rubber, leather or velvet bases to protect them against accidental damage and scratches so it might come as a surprise to find linoleum used in this particular application - and in this case, the choice was Ostermann's popular furniture linoleum.

At the consultation desks in the back of the shop, this natural, pleasant material was permanently integrated into the tabletops. The linoleum's matt black colouring fits perfectly with the dark coloured elements within the natural, veined patterning of the marble décor.

In addition to a delivery by the metre, Ostermann now supplies linoleum (Desktop and Bulletin Board) customised to your required length and width. The surfaces are cut with millimetre precision and can be pressed immediately after delivery. The inconvenient step of cutting the material in the workshop is no longer necessary, saving both processing time and waste from unnecessary material remnants and reducing the potential for error.



### Cutting, spreading and pattern-matching made easy by Assyst Bullmer's automatic upholstery solutions.

hen HSL Chairs decided to take the plunge and order their first automatic fabric cutting machine, they chose Assyst Bullmer's Multiply machine, the Bullmer Turbocut and a Bullmer Compact600 Spreading machine.

With Cutting depth of 2.5cm of compressed material and cutting speeds of up to 80m/min, the Turbocut allowed HSL cut material significantly quicker than before and with greater accuracy. Paired with a Bullmer Compact600 spreader for automatic material unwinding and spreading, high volume orders became easy and much quicker, providing HSL with a significant time and labour saving, as all the cutting could now become a one-man operation.

The cutter was placed on rails, which allowed it to move between spreading tables, reducing downtime.

HSL's first investment was back in 2014. A few years later, HSL had stepped up its production and needed to add an additional cutting line to work alongside the Turbocut. This time they ordered the Bullmer Procut

- the ultimate machine for mass production. Capable of cutting up to 10cm of compressed material at the same speed as the Turbocut, it was again prudent to couple this with a Bullmer Compact600 spreading machine.



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
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# Perfect painting

Under the direction of Mark Murgatroyd, Prestige Coatings Ltd is automating its spraying operations with a Superfici Mini P from SCM UK. aint, painting, preparation, materials...
there's not much Mark Murgatroyd
doesn't know about them. Now the
managing director of Whetstone-based
Prestige Coatings Ltd, Mark is putting his
decades of experience in the coatings sector
behind the company he's joined and is
broadening its offer from the cosmetic
automotive, metal and plastic finishing PCL
has excelled at for many years to
concentrate more on developing its wood
finishing division. And key to his vision for
the future is automation.


"Wood finishing is our speciality," Mark told Furniture Journal. "But our aim is to develop from the wood finishing we currently offer into a one-stop shop so customers can either send us panels to be finished, or a complete cutting list so we can source materials, make and finish the components they need and supply them with a fast-turnaround service. We've just invested in a Superfici Mini, we have a DMC

brushing sander arriving at the end of the week and a second on order, and further down the line we are looking at putting in nesting routers, edgebanders and edge sealers for sealing the edge of the MDF. We want to offer furniture manufacturers a fast-turnaround cutting and painting service with the exceptionally high quality of finish demanded by the automotive industry."

In preparation, PCL – shortly to be rebranded Rocket Performance Coatings to more accurately reflect the fire-rated and other specialist coatings it also has something of a name for – has built a small industrial estate to house what Mark expects will soon be several automatic painting and finishing lines. Pride of place has been given to a Superfici Mini Plus P from SCM.

So why did he choose the Superfici Mini Plus P?

"I know all the manufacturers of automatic spray machines and I know what their machines are capable of," Mark told me

candidly."I went straight to Superfici because I knew they had a machine that was compact and it fit into the building we wanted it to go in. A lot of the other machines would have been too big. Generally, the bigger machines are faster but we didn't need that kind of speed. If you've got a 100m curing tunnel and you have to maintain 9m/min because that's what the tunnel runs at, you need a fast machine. We're running at 3m/min but when you do the maths on the Superfici Mini, it's already got the capacity to make a comfortable 100 square metres per hour When the machine we've got reaches that level I'll put another shift on and run 16 hours a day - and that's when we'll start looking at a second line. We've already made space for a second Superfici."

Delivery would have been a major issue for PCL with some potential suppliers quoting a lengthy wait but SCM was able to supply a machine within Mark's timeframe: "Even before the machine arrived, we had work

waiting to go on it. We were under pressure to get into production with some big orders we had to get out. SCM told me they would deliver on the 4th August and the machine came in on 1st. It took a week to install - and that was really good going because I insisted on four sets of lines not two, two sets of guns not one and two Speedy Cups. There were a lot of extras to be fitted."

The Superfici Mini is indeed a compact machine with a total length of just over three-and-a-half metres and that includes an infeed roller conveyor of 676mm and an outfeed conveyor of 707mm. But with a working width of 1300mm and a maximum workpiece thickness of 120mm, it's quite capable of spraying the fire doors and the larger furniture components Mark wanted to put through it. In fact, Mark had the bulkhead raised to 250mm from 160mm so he could send 160mm drawers through. "It's outside the parameters of the machine," he admits, "But when the sprayers looked at the



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samples that were coming out, they agreed no one could hand spray that well. It gets beautifully into every corner."

The Superfici Mini Plus P is taller by a metre or so than the basic Superfici Mini version. That's because the cabin is pressurised for better overspray management. The Plus P version has an additional filter unit mounted on top of the cabin that ensures enhanced ventilation control inside and that's in addition to a double dry filter air suction system with integrated exhaust fans. Separate exhausts for the left and right filter tanks guarantee suction air is always perfectly balanced.

For increased flexibility, Mark wanted four lines instead of the two supplied as standard: "Because we have four usable lines on this machine we can run two high pressure and two low pressure systems if we need to. Low pressure means no bounce back, which makes this machine perfect for drawers, while being able to run high pressure means it can be very paint-efficient when we want it to be. If one line ever went down, having four lines also gives us spares."

The Mini Plus P comes as standard with Superfici's 'Quick Change' system and Mark confirms it's super efficient: "We can have four guns on high pressure, four on low pressure, or if we wanted to go from high pressure to low pressure we'd only need to snap two levers open, push the unit up and lift it out, then put low pressure guns on. Connect to a second line with low pressure and we can go from high pressure to low pressure in about 10 minutes. The big advantage is we can switch from primer to top coating in next to no time and one unit can be cleaned out while the next is working."


Superfici users can specify the guns they prefer but Mark was in no doubt he wanted a set of Wagner's Airmix GA4000s, which SCM supplied together with five Type 13-80 nozzles, five Type 11-80 nozzles and a set of four Wagner ASP low pressure Airmix guns with 0.8mm nozzles. "The beauty of the low-pressure Wagner's is they are on a click system," he told me. "Three click turns in means you get less paint out; three click turns on the air adjustment means your fan will

start to come in. We can adjust the fans down to a pencil line. We optimise the air cap angle: gun one at the front and gun four at the back spray vertically while the others are slightly offset so they get exactly into the corners. The Superfici fires the guns exactly where they need to be. It's so fast you can't even see it.

"If we put one guy on a 42 square metre kitchen he needs to sand-seal it, sand it, prime it, sand it, then top coat it. It takes a week and that's not including the drying time. The Superfici running at 2m/min will do all the painting in a couple of hours and the machine will do a better job, especially in the corners.

"The finish we are getting from the Superfici with these guns is better than we can hand spray, it's more consistent, it's right every time and it's repeatable. In corners, it never puddles. This machine is perfect for applying the hydroscopic coatings we need for firerated products where we must measure coating thicknesses with an ultrasonic sound micrometer and record that information for the OME when the product goes into the building. It's that accurate."

Mark adds, "And we've had the best spatter finish we've ever seen from this machine. It's just perfect. Even the most experienced sprayer can't achieve that."


There were a few other extras Mark wanted on his Superfici Mini: the laser system, which measures components entering the machine, is essential for the in-frame door sets many of his customers now want. It reads the frame and the gaps constantly and knows exactly when to cut the guns off, saving paint.

He also ordered two Speedy Cups with a pneumatic pump. The two-litre containers are ideal when small lacquer quantities are required and, says Mark, they are big enough to coat about six square metres."We haven't got the quick colour change system that would enable us to go up to four colours at a time yet but we will have."

Controlling the Superfici Mini Plus P is a B&R PLC control with 5.7" colour touch screen and easy-to-use Optispray software and for simplicity it's recipe-driven. "We can put recipes in, number them and it will

remember everything from pump pressure to the tips you've used. All you do is call up the recipe you want and it will run that again. Once it's set right, the consistency with this machine doesn't change – and I can run it with one operator. He doesn't need to be in full head gear and a full suit all day and having the Superfici does away with the need for sixmonthly health checks for employees and the need to have compressor people in to check all the filters. We just need to make sure we're using a negative pressure system so nothing gets out to atmosphere. It creates a much better environment for our employees - so much so that we already have a few who would like to be trained to use it."

Mark is one delighted SCM customer. His Mini P is transforming his company, giving him increased throughput, better quality and absolute consistency - and it hasn't cost him an arm and a leg. rom metal workpieces to automotive components and wood, Wagner's high-speed rotary atomisers can be used to achieve extremely efficient coating results on both small and large workpieces.

The Topfinish Bell IS and Topfinish RobotBell I are equally well suited as allround units for water-based and solvent-based coatings. Both models are now available as variants with external charge. They have been specially developed for demanding applications with water-based paints, where a particularly high coating quality is required.

The high voltage emitted via the electrode ring ionises the ambient air in such a way that the sprayed material is charged. The grounded workpiece is electrostatically coated.

Compared to internal charging, external charging has the considerable advantage that the overall system does not have to be specially insulated for use with water-based coatings, reducing equipment costs significantly.

Both models can process higher-viscosity materials, too. The modular concept means they can be converted in just a few minutes to a version with internal charging for use with solvent-based coatings. The Topfinish RobotBell I ECH is mounted on a robot arm, while the Topfinish Bell IS ECH is specially designed for use with reciprocators and linear axes systems.

The new versions also enable large spray pattern variations (70-800 mm). Alternative disk sizes and adjustable steering airs are available. An internal and external flushing device of the bell disk, as well as the direct disposal of excess material via a drain valve, ensure short colour change times for fast cycle times in highly automated coating.

Depending on the material, flow rate and workpiece, fine atomisation means an application efficiency of over 80% can be achieved. An exhaust air concept, which discharges the exhaust air to the rear, further optimises the coating result.

Wagner uses the same basic components for all high-speed rotary atomisers – turbine or bell disks and the easily replaceable valve blocks. The spare and wear parts are also identical. Simple operation, robust technology and durable components made of stainless steel reduce the effort required for assembly and maintenance.

standard, others optional - that enable you to customise it to suit the way you want to work and put this machine in a class of its own.

One of the Brema Eko 2.2's key selling points is zero setup time, which makes it a good machine to look at more closely if you process numerous batches with relatively few panels in each batch. Using a laser, the machine detects the size of the panel and adjusts all the operations from that.

From an operator perspective, it couldn't be simpler to work with: a batch of barcoded panels from a panel saw or a beam saw is scanned by the operator using the optional barcode reader, which loads it into the work list automatically. All the operator has to do is place each panel on the machine one at a time and collect it when it's been processed.

"It will use the x-axis laser to detect the size of the panel, then it carries out the operation and returns the panel either on

the left or on the right, or through a panel return system," says Paul."There's always a single panel going through but the machine can be loaded either manually - a one-man operation - or by robot. The loading area is on the left but unloading can be left or right. The grippers take the panel into the machine, it runs the program and it can be sent out to the right of the machine or brought back to the left."


But it's not just zero setup time the Brema Eko 2.2 offers. Using an encoder integrated into the gripper to read the thickness of each board as it passes, the machine is also able to provide zero reference: "Zero reference of the operating group is a big USP," says Paul. "If you put a panel in that should be 18mm and it's actually 18.5mm, it doesn't matter because you have the reference on the correct side. Many machines won't do that. The software will

adjust the program in real time without the operator even knowing it's happening. When you put your cabinet together, you get a nice flush carcase every time because everything is worked off the zero reference."

Where some vertical drilling machines have one gripper, Biesse has equipped its Eko 2.2 with two and both have independent brushless motors. The main driver behind this was the greater precision and rigidity required for zero referencing but it's also essential where panels that require a longer stroke than the maximum 1500mm in the x-axis have to be moved.

And that brings us to another interesting number.

Equipped with the optional High Performance (HP) kit Brema released last year, the grippers on the Eko 2.2 will move panels at a speed of 110m/min - more than four times faster than a non-HP-equipped









Eko 2.2. And that, says Paul, increases the performance of the machine significantly:

"When the grippers are moving, typically they will move at 25m/min. With the HP kit, it will move them at 110m/min. The grippers reshuffle with one gripper staying connected while then other moves. It's all about how fast the panel moves in the x-axis. By adding an HP kit, we can reduce panel processing time significantly. Every time the panel moves it moves at 110m/min."

The greatest benefit is when processing larger panels. On a typical 400mm × 250mm drawer front the HP kit saves a couple of seconds while on a 3200 × 250mm bookshelf side, Biesse's demonstration shows a whopping 26 second time-saving.

Of course, having an HP kit fitted to an Eko 2.2 that moves panels at a rate of 110m/

min does mean adding guards to protect the operator – but that's where the machine's footprint becomes 17 square metres. Without the HP kit, only 10 square metres are needed and it is a retrofittable option if you don't need the speed to start with.

Inside the machine are yet more interesting numbers: the Eko 2.2 can be equipped with either a single drilling head, or two independently operating drilling heads and there is a choice of two different types of HSK electrospindle. The upper BH23 head can accommodate 7+7 vertical drills, 6+2 horizontal drills and a 120mm diameter saw while the lower BH21 head takes 7+6 vertical drills and 6+2 horizontals. As an alternative, you could specify one BH28 head, which would accommodate 7+10 verticals, 6+2 horizontals and a 120mm diameter saw.

As a further option, Biesse has provided the facility for an eight-position automatic toolchanger on one of the heads — an unusual feature for this type of machine. Being able to manage aggregates is a huge advantage because it basically means even a complex drilling pattern can be achieved using one program and there's no need for the operator to stop midway through to change aggregates.

"The eight-position toolchanger is a big USP," confirms Paul. "We can actually manage aggregates within the toolchanger so if you did want to use a sawblade, for example, you can manage it with the toolchanger. Some machines on the market have a toolchanger but can't manage aggregates. The Brema 2.2 will. If you have a program that needs two aggregates, you have to have two programs with some machines and physically put the







aggregate into the head. Having to put the aggregate into the head slows down the process. You don't get that with the Eko 2.2."

Combined with the macros in the bSolid software used to run the machine, the flexibility in the heads and the toolchanger of the Brema Eko 2.2 make it possible (as an option) to cut pockets for panel fixings and Biesse has macros covering all the major fixings from Lamello, IF and Ovvo as well as cam and dowel systems. "If you have a particular fitting such as a Clamex, you can use the saw blade for this," confirms Paul. "It won't insert the hardware but it will machine the panel to take the hardware. The macro is already in the program and there is an option available for gluing and inserting dowels."

The number of options available for the Eko 2.2 is quite broad and, in addition to

those already mentioned, includes a kit to detect the real height of the panel, a kit for processing of 2.5mm thick panels and, for anyone processing painted panels or high gloss, a kit for processing panels with delicate surfaces.

"The Brema 2.2 was invented for the end of the process so if you have a high gloss door, you would want to drill after spraying so you don't see spray overspill in the hinge holes," explains Paul."We have a delicate panels kit that reduces the risk of scratching. All the rollers have a special finish like a felt cover rather than being hard and there are rubberised rollers for the panel to run on."

There are surprisingly few limitations to the Brema Eko 2.2. It will route but you wouldn't want to attempt serious routing of shapes on it because there is nowhere for

the offcuts to fall and if the range of profiles you wanted to machine extended beyond 25mm, the grippers wouldn't be able to grip the panel. But bar these, it's a very versatile, very fast, easy-to-use, compact drilling machine - probably one of the most productive in its class. It's certainly a machine worthy of a closer look if you're in need of a compact drilling solution and by the end of the year, Biesse Group UK should have one to demonstrate with a panel return system in their Daventry showroom.

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



Swiss **PRECISION** cutting technology



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here's a bit of a digital and e-commerce revolution happening in the tranquil setting of the South Downs, the home of hardwood timber specialist English Woodlands Timber. Since the start of the pandemic the company has pulled out all the stops for its online marketing activities and as a result has achieved record sales as well as a large number of new customers.

Catering for the bespoke and high-end construction, joinery, furniture and kitchen sectors, the company is experiencing huge demand for its niche products, which include boards, cladding and structural timber as well as a wide range of species such as oak, elm, ash and sweet chestnut. Fundamental to its success is the fact that each and every item stocked is now also available to view and buy via the web shop.

Equally important, however, is the ability to efficiently fulfil what Director Ian McNally calls the "pick, pack and dispatch" side of operations once orders have been received. For this, English Woodlands Timber (EWT)

has switched to products from Irish handling specialist Combilift, which have been instrumental in enabling it to keep pace with the recent 50% growth in business. Having previously used mainstream counterbalance forklifts, lan and his team were won over by the multi-directional abilities of Combilift's C-Series trucks when they saw one in operation at another timber supplier.

Having taken delivery of the first C4000E model in 2019, two of these four-tonne trucks are now in operation at the four-acre site, together with two two-tonne capacity Combi-WR4 multi-directional pedestrian stacker trucks. The latter feature Combilift's unique patented multi-position tiller arm which enables the operator to work at the side of the unit rather than at the rear when working in narrow confines for enhanced safety. EWT's materials handling consultants, Locators, supplied all the trucks and also recommended a wider than standard fork carriage of 1950mm for the WR4 models, which increases load stability when carrying six-metre-long packs or boards.

When English Woodlands Timber launched into online marketing, it was Combilift who helped them fulfil orders.





"What differentiates us from other suppliers is our quality and diverse range, best summed up as the choice of length, width and thickness of our products," said lan. "But we need to ensure that our own pick, pack and despatch procedures match the ease and efficiency with which customers can select and buy packs and individual boards. The Combilifts can handle all the varied and awkward sized boards we stock, they are nimble, manoeuvrable and allow us to work more quickly."

The ability to move six-metre lengths sideways with the C4000E trucks has done away with the need for wide aisles and access areas in the undercover warehouse, and the widths between packs stored outdoors have been more than halved down to three metres compared to the six to eight metres needed for the old twodirectional counterbalance trucks. Storing most product in four-metre high racking rather than block stacking has also made best use of vertical capacity and lan reckons that at least 35% extra space has been gained in the existing footprint. This is set to increase once another Combi-WR4 is brought in for use in the machine shop.

A further advantage of the Combilifts is their versatility, not just when it comes to lifting and moving products around inside and out, but also their ability to double up as portable work stations to rest boards on whilst they are logged, numbered and photographed before being put online. Owner and MD Tom Compton is particularly impressed with the performance of the Combi-WR4s. "This one operator/ one machine combination has been transformative and has improved productivity by 30-40% compared to the old trucks. In spite of their relatively small size they can easily lift packs of timber from the top bay of racking. An added bonus is that training staff to use them takes just a few hours."

Sustainability is also a byword at the EWT woodyard, with solar panels on roofs wherever possible, charging stations for those who drive electric vehicles, chippings are used for biomass and other material is recycled into bedding for horses. "It's electric power wherever possible here and nothing goes to waste," says lan. Electric Combilifts were therefore the machines of choice, as they are emission free and are also very

quiet compared to diesel machines – something that's appreciated by all on site. Due to the general move to cleaner operation in many sectors, over half of Combilifts now manufactured in the Monaghan HQ are electric powered.

Thanks to its digital offering, EWT's customer base has expanded not only in quantity but also in geographical reach.
