STEP ONE

Clean the wall surface with isopropyl rubbing alcohol to remove any dust or residue, wipe gently and allow to dry.

STEP TWO

Separate Command™ Picture Hanging Strips at the perforation, then connect fasteners by pressing firmly together until they snap. Remove one green and white liner and position in a corner of your frame. Repeat for each of the remaining three corners. Ensure you press firmly each time. Then position your frame on the wall and hold for 30 seconds.

Remove your frame by holding the bottom edge and lifting outwards from wall. To remove strips left on the wall, lightly press the top of the strip and grab the tab. Slowly pull the tab straight downwards along the wall. You will see the strip slowly lift up from the surface, removing cleanly.

- → Choose the correct size depending on what you are hanging. For example the MEDIUM STRIPS hold up to 5.4kg and the LARGE STRIPS hold up to 7.2kg.
- → If you have black or dark coloured frames, use the BLACK coloured strips. This will ensure they are completely invisible from the side. Choose WHITE strips for lighter coloured frames.
- If you already have prints hanging, but they never seem to sit quite straight, use Command™ Frame Stabilizer strips in each bottom corner. They keep frames straight in almost any position.





'When using oil-based paint there is no need to clean your brush before the second coat. Wipe the excess paint from the bristles and put the brush in a jar of clean cold water filled

to 5mm below the brush's metal collar. The water stops air getting in and the oil-based paint can't set.

'When it's time for the next coat, a day or even a week later, take the brush from the water and scrape it five times on scrap cardboard then you're ready to paint. No clean-up or turps needed,' says Dave.

BUYER'S GUDE TIES AND STRAPS

Super stretchy

Don't drive like a nanna because you're worried your surfboard isn't secure on the roof rack. Keep it tied tight with Cordzilla Stretch Rope, about \$17. 

THE BALCONY GARDEN

Sydney landscaper Josh Harrison (harrisonslandscaping.com.au) says a deck is the perfect way to bring a natural feel into a tired backyard.

'A lot of the older style architecture in Australia features large expanses of paving and, particularly in our sunny climate, the glare can make it look bleached out,' says Josh.

'A timber deck is ideal for softening the space as well as adding great function. Like anything, you get what you pay for. If space is limited, use large-format, wide boards, so there are fewer gaps to distract the eye.

Josh advises paying close attention to construction techniques and fastening mechanisms.

'We generally use treated pine frames on all our decks so the timber is always raised from the ground for good ventilation.

'If you don't do this, the boards act like a sponge, absorbing too much moisture and will be prone to swelling and cupping.'














AHEAD OF THE CURVE

Award-winning Melbourne landscaper Paal Grant likes to treat a deck like a sculpture (paalgrant.com.au).


'Instead of a regular square finish, I like rounded shapes that mimic nature more closely,' says Paal.

'Construction is harder, of course. It takes about three times as long to build a curved deck as it does a regular one.

'We sometimes rip out decks only a couple of years old. The most common error is not leaving enough space between boards.'

Paal's advice is to meet Australian construction standards then exceed them.

'Over-engineering takes a deck from ordinary to amazing.'



STEPS TO SUCCESS

Three elements define the success of a deck, says Daniel Angotti of Modern Outdoor Living, based in Melbourne (modernoutdoorliving.com.au).


'There's practical, aesthetic and resale vale. A great deck satisfies all three criteria to differing degrees,' says Daniel.

'The traditional approach used to be very practical. A deck had to be a square or a rectangle, and use lots of timber in the balustrading. These days, we focus on consistency.

'A deck has to have a relationship with the house and the landscape. It's a more fluid approach that keeps evolving and also means a customised result for each person.'

Daniel says that a deck will always pay for itself in resale value, but a well-planned yard with integrated deck can add so much more.

A SENSE OF SCALE

Landscape designer Justin Bajada, from Origin Landscapes in Perth, says size is everything in a deck (originlandscapes.com.au).


'Scale works when it comes to decking design. If you are going to incorporate the look and feel of timber into your garden, let it have the impact it deserves,' says John.

'As house architecture changes, as it has changed pretty dramatically over the past 10 years or so, great decking areas have become something that most people want.'

Justin has also noticed an increased interest in themed areas, taking influence from all over the world.

'You might want to create an African-looking garden, which is well suited in terms of planting, but the textures and colours might not work with the timber you've chosen.

'When you are planning a deck, make it part of the whole picture.'



SPACE IN THE SUBURBS

Landscape designer Evan Robins, from Scenic Scapes in Brisbane, says that no backyard in Queensland would be without a deck, whether built into the home or attached to the back of a house (scenicscapes.com.au).

'Not for us the dinky little courtyards like you see in Sydney or Melbourne. Here in the Queensland suburbs it's all about space,' says Evan.

'Most of the places I work on would be at least 1000sqm blocks and

an average deck build would be 60 to 80 metres. There are pros and cons to working on this scale.


'With no size limitations, deck design tends to be fairly standard whereas in smaller, more tricky spaces the envelope has to be pushed.'

Evan says if you do have plenty of space, focus on quality.

'Invest in the best timbers and neatest fastening systems, and choose balustrading that doesn't get in the way of a view.'







Outdoor designer Matt Coates of Life Outside in Sydney has seen big shifts in what people want from a deck in recent years (lifeoutside.com.au).

'The whole concept of living outdoors has really pushed design, and so how people interact with their space has evolved too,' says Matt.

'It's not just about how it looks, but how it feels. Sunken areas are a feature we often include, so you are sitting in the landscape, not on top of it.

'This can be one of the most successful inclusions that will be used

all year round, particularly if there is a fire of some kind.

'Even in summer, an outdoor fire in the evening is something most people love to sit around. Fire pits are the new water feature.

'Once the design is decided, the details are everything. We tend to picture-frame finish, which makes a real difference to the end result.

The quality of the construction and materials are what ultimately sets a great deck apart from an average one. 'Australian hardwoods are attractive and popular but they are not well suited to sunny areas.

Composite boards,

meanwhile, have improved in quality and can work in almost any area as they're non-permeable.

'People generally want to spend much less time on maintenance and want boards that look aged or recycled, and composite boards offer all that.

'I'd say it's 50/50 these days between hardwood and composite and I see it only increasing in the future.'



or a backyard that sees a lot of activity during the warmer months, a small change can make a big difference to the enjoyment of an already popular area.

This is particularly true when replacing a troublesome eyesore with a luxurious poolside feature.

Handyman Technical editor Frank Gardner had always struggled with

Fasteners

one corner of his poolside garden. The triangular section was sloped and, over the years, had been landscaped with rocks and a variety of plants.

But the site's constant exposure to harsh sunlight meant that weeds and an enthusiastic creeper were the only successful inhabitants.

Frank's solution was to build a timber lido deck, raised above the uneven ground on brick piers.

The deck was built a step down from the existing paved area to create separation and two timber bollards were added to enhance the resort-style build.

This new deck soon became known as The Landing and has become a popular spot to dry out after a dip.

Not all problem areas are identical, but whatever you wish to disguise with a deck, the basic steps for building the structure will be the same. If your deck is to be a similar size, the cost will also be comparable.

Always check with your local council about relevant approval regulations and to ensure all the deck components, sizes and timber spans meet Australian standards.



Building a step

If the optimal height for new decking is lower than the surrounding hard surfaces, incorporate a step into the design.

Build the step frame using 200 x 50mm treated pine sleepers with joists at 450mm centres. For this site, one end was extended to retain the adjacent garden bed.

Backfill the step with dry mortar mix and set the existing pavers that butt against it on a wet mix of mortar at the level of the step.

Use 65mm x 8g stainless steel decking screws to assemble the box then clad both the tread and riser with decking boards.

CHOOSE THE TIMBER

Timber for outdoor use needs to be resistant to rot and termites.

Hardwoods such as tallowwood and merbau are durable with a rich natural colour, but they're expensive. Even if you're only building a small deck the cost will quickly add up.

A far more economical option is treated pine. We used it for all parts of this deck including the bearers, joists, decking, bollards and retaining sleepers.

Treated pine is lightweight, easy to work with and will last decades if you look after it. Seal all cut ends and surfaces with a preservative, oil-based paint or a treated pine sealing agent.

To finish, we applied three coats of grey decking stain to the decking and bollards for a naturally weathered look and to fit with the neutral palette of the pool surrounds.




Making the bollards

Timber bollards made from 1200 x 100mm treated pine posts were installed to flank the step. Use a router with a 20mm roundover bit to soften the tops of the posts then make the bollards.



1 CUT GALVANISED STRAPPING to length and secure it 30mm from the top of the posts with 40 x 2mm galvanised clouts. Wind rope below the strapping and secure with clouts.



2 NOTCH THE BASE of the posts to fit over the step, making 30mm deep relief cuts to match the step height using a mitresaw. Chisel out the waste then smooth the surface using a hand plane.



3 POSITION THE BOLLARD on the step, using a spirit level to check for plumb then drill two 8mm pilot holes, attaching the bollard to the riser with 130 x M8 TechShield coachscrews.

BUILD THE DECK



1 Excavate the area Clear any vegetation and mark out the area for the deck, setting pegs in each corner. Use a water level or spirit level and straightedge to mark the finished height of the deck on the pegs then excavate the site to the required depth.



Pour the footings
Set out the pier positions then dig
300 x 300 holes to 400mm deep and
fill with concrete, checking for level
between them. The top of the footings
should finish 285mm below deck level.
TIP To make concrete, mix aggregate,
sand and cement in a 4:2:1 ratio.



3 Build the piers
Add water and a mortar plasticiser such as Bycol to premixed mortar to construct 230 x 230mm brick piers, checking for level across the tops and between the piers. Cover the piers with dampcourse and ant capping then cut weedmat to fit.



Install the decking boards
Lay three or four rows of boards
at a time to fit neatly between the
contained edges or with 50mm of
overhang at the exposed ends. Use
a combination square to mark the
centre position of each joist then use
3.75mm nails as spacers for the boards.




Stain the deck
Scrub down the decking surface
with deck cleaner, rinse off with
a hose and allow to dry thoroughly.
Sand the deck surface with 120 grit
sandpaper and remove all dust then
apply two or three coats of deck stain
using a lambswool applicator.



Assemble the framework
Position the bearers on the piers
and check for level along and across
the bearers, packing as needed. Use
a builder's square to position the first
joist perpendicular to the bearers.
Space the remaining joists at 450mm
centres and skew-nail to the bearers.


5 Add the retaining sleepers Cut 200mm wide sleepers to fit between the ends of the deck joists and the raised garden bed. Position the sleepers flush with the top of the joists and secure with galvanised bullethead nails to the ends of the joists then build and install the step.



Align and trim the boards
Set a stringline along every fifth
row to check the boards are straight
and adjust by opening or closing the
gaps. Mark a cut line on the decking
edge, leaving a 20mm overhang. Cut
using a circular saw and straightedge
guide then round over the edges.

Secure the cladding

Cut the riser fascia boards to width so the top boards finish flush with the sleepers, cutting mitres on the corners and securing with screws. Cut the tread boards with 15mm overhang at the front and sides, securing at 450mm centres to the step joists.

ost decks in Australia are constructed using traditional methods and materials.

Digging holes for piers or posts and concreting them in to support bearers and joists is the accepted way to install a deck, and can take up to a week.

But there are now products available that provide faster and easier ways to build and maintain decking.

This 4500 x 4130mm platform deck, positioned off the family room at the rear of the house, was built in just a couple of days using 36 Handi Blocks made from fibre reinforced concrete.

If the ground is level, space the 8kg blocks evenly on the site to match joist spacing, usually 450mm. Slot the joists onto the blocks and attach the end trim boards to create a strong solid framework to carry the decking boards.

On sloping sites, fit posts cut to length to create a level deck, keeping it less than one metre in height.

CHOOSE THE BOARDS

Merbau, treated pine, and other hardwoods need regular maintenance to sustain the timber. Cleaning and oiling needs to be done annually.

For a low-upkeep choice, consider installing composite decking, which is also eco-friendly.

ModWood decking is made from recycled items like plastic milk bottles and pine waste from certified plantation-grown, sustainably managed forests. It comes in a range of different colours and two widths.

Usually, decking boards are secured to the joists with screws, leaving the screw heads visible from above. Here, the fasteners are hidden thanks to the KlevaKlip system made specifically for use with ModWood boards.

The clips lock into grooves along the edges of the decking, creating even gaps between the boards, and a box of 40 secures 9sqm of decking. The perimeter of the deck should be kept open to allow ventilation underneath. TIP Contact your local building authority to make sure your deck design and materials are approved before starting construction.



Fasteners

Attach the end trim boards to the joist ends using 75mm x 14g galvanised bugle screws.

Secure the KlevaKlip strips to the timber joists using 30mm x 8g galvanised button-head screws.

The decking boards are held within the clip strip system using a daub of construction adhesive for added strength.

The rear of the home was uninspiring, with no connection to the outdoors.

ADD A ROOF

The split-bamboo roof allows dappled light to filter through onto the deck, providing a shady spot to sit and relax while soaking up the views.

A panel of bamboo fencing was supported by two traditionally turned verandah posts at the outside deck corners.

The posts were connected with a front beam, and four rafters run back to the house fascia with two rows of trimmers secured between.

Sheets of Suntuf 2.4m Clear Polycarbonate roofing were laid across the top.

This will prolong the life of the bamboo by shielding it from the elements, and makes the roof watertight.


The roof added just \$800 to the total cost of the build.



1 Set the posts

After the blocks and joists are set out, excavate two 300 x 300 x 400mm deep holes and fill with concrete. Set the galvanised post stirrups in position, allow the concrete to set, then stand and brace the posts in the stirrups, securing with galvanised bolts.





2 Install the framework Secure a 140 x 45mm beam to the inside of the posts using galvanised cuphead bolts. Attach 90 x 45mm rafters from the beam to the house fascia using metal hangers, with two rows of trimmers between the rafters as attachment points for the roof.



Attach the roofing


Position the bamboo panels face down and secure with 50mm x 8g stainless decking screws to the rafters, trimmers and beam. Overlay the bamboo with clear polycarbonate and secure using Clearfix self-drilling screws at every third ridge. >



BUILD THE DECK




2 Set out the blocks Position and space the Handi Blocks accurately to match your setout plan and joist spacings, placing the first row as close as possible to the house. TIP Make sure the blocks are sitting completely flat on the ground otherwise the joists may move.




4 Position the deck joists
Cut the remaining deck joists to
length and position across the blocks,
inside the end trimmers. Check for
straightness then secure to the end
trimmers with screws. Secure the trim
blocks on joist hangers at either end
using galvanised clouts.




Level the blocks
Check the Handi Blocks for level in both directions using a long spirit level or straight timber joist and spirit level, adjusting any blocks that don't fit the level setout by moving them up or down as needed.




3 Square the frame Position the first and last joists on the blocks and attach the end trim boards using bugle screws to complete the deck shape. Use a builder's square to check the corner layout for square, measuring the diagonals to check. Adjust if needed.




Set a stringline across the joists to match the clip width. Secure the strips of KlevaKlips on all the joists, making sure they all line up perfectly straight. TIP The KlevaKlip system will ensure consistent spacing of about 4mm between the boards.



Add the decking
Apply a 10mm bead of construction adhesive across the centre of the clip. Position the board edge groove on one side of the clip and snap the board into place by walking along it. Use the supplied fixing tool to tap the spurs into the edge of each board as you go.







Built to entertain

Ever since Handyman reader Tanya Butcher and her husband Michael moved into their home, they had been unhappy with the backyard.

All the right elements were there including a pool and patio, but the space wasn't as appealing as it could be.

'It felt unloved and sparse. It also seemed to lack warmth,' says Tanya.

The couple set about revamping the area, creating an expansive deck with an outdoor kitchen as the focal point.

Rather than removing the patio, they cut into the paving to allow stirrups to be concreted in, then laid merbau decking on top.

The outdoor kitchen was fitted with a granite benchtop, barbecue, bar fridge and downlights for atmosphere.

The undercover area was completed with ceiling fans and lounge seating.

A final touch was removing the old metal pool fence and installing glass fencing to help open up the area.

'We achieved what we set out to do, create a backyard with personality, warmth and useable space,' says Tanya.





DECKING QUICK FIXES

Revamp your timber deck in time for summer with these maintenance tips and tricks

backyard deck is often overlooked during winter but really comes into its own during the summer months.

Keep your deck looking like new and avoid expensive repairs by staying on top of regular maintenance. Fix common problems DIY and refinish the timber once a year.

TIP Get the kids involved in jobs such as refinishing the deck, and turn a chore into a fun family activity.

Take a peek below the surface to ensure the structural elements of your deck are in good shape. Replacing a joist or bearer can be difficult, but a solid framework is essential for the safe enjoyment of your deck.

EXAMINE THE JOISTS to make sure they are solidly seated in the hangers, check that the ledger is attached firmly to the wall and that there is no movement in the bearers or posts.

CHECK THE POSTS are plumb. Secure extra bracing if needed to keep them upright.

REPAIR THE HANDRAILS if there is any sign of rot, and tighten wires on balustrades that have slackened. **REPLACE THE FASTENERS** holding the framing members if they have corroded or worked loose.

Replace a broken board

A broken or splitting board presents a hazard to children or anyone walking barefoot on the deck. Instead of using a whole new board, replace the damaged section with a length of timber that spans at least three joists.



1 DRAW SQUARE LINES to one side of the joists beneath. Use a jigsaw to cut away the damaged section of the board then remove the board using a pinch bar.



2 DRILL CLEARANCE HOLES in two 400mm long timber cleats. Apply construction adhesive, hold the cleats up to the boards and secure one to the joist at each end of the repair.



3 CUT THE NEW BOARD to fit and tap it in position using an offcut to protect the timber. Drill pilot holes and secure with two 65mm x 10g deck screws into the cleat and joists.

Glean the surface
An oiled or stained deck only
needs thorough cleaning a few
times a year to keep it looking great.

Remove stains and grime with a specialised cleaner. Choose a product that suits the timber and the finish that was last applied.

Water activates the cleaner, so hose the deck then work on one square metre at a time. Hose the area again then apply the cleaner using a stiff yard broom to work it into the surface.

Leave the deck to soak for about 15 minutes without letting it dry out

completely, then hose it until the water runs clean and leave to dry for a day or two before applying the finish.

TIP Treat any areas of algae, mildew or mould with a specialised product applied using a stiff bristle brush.

Sand to refresh

Years of neglect can result in badly weathered boards that need refinishing. Before applying paint, stain or oil, carry out any surface repairs then sand the timber.

If the boards were secured with nails, and the filler has popped out but the fasteners are still sound, apply new putty over the nail heads.

For a deck that was stained or oiled, sand it all over then give it a good clean with a pressure cleaner before applying the new finish.

If the deck was painted, use a random orbital sander fitted with an 80 grit disc, working across the deck and sanding two boards at a time.

Patch a rotting post


Decay can be caused by the end grain of a post being in contact with termites and moisture. In some conditions, even a galvanised post support can corrode. Make repairs and improve the runoff instead of replacing the post.



1 SEAL THE TOP POST with timber preservative, then use a spatula to apply two-part exterior filler into the damaged area to protect it from future water penetration.



EXPOSE THE BASE of the post by making a cut line using an angle grinder with a diamond cutting disc to cut a square in the concrete covering the base.



3 CHISEL OUT WASTE with a lump hammer and cold chisel to expose the post and the stirrup, cutting a drainage line to prevent water from pooling, then seal the timber.

Repair a rail
Handrails are an important safety feature, and there are strict guidelines about when and how they must be incorporated into the structure of a deck.

Apply epoxy adhesive into mitred corners if they are opening up and secure a screw through the points of the mitres to pull them tightly closed.

If any parts of the rail have rotted, treat them with timber preservative, apply two-part filler and leave to cure. Sand it flush with the surrounding timber then refinish the handrail.

There is only so much sanding, cleaning and refinishing that a deck can take and if the boards get in bad enough shape, eventually you'll need to replace them with new ones.

A typical 20 square metre deck requires more than 1000 fasteners just to secure the boards.

Choosing the wrong type of screw or failing to drill pilot holes can result in the heads wrenching off or camming out, or boards splitting and requiring repairs.

The type and size of decking board you are working with will determine which fasteners to use. Boards are typically 19 to 25mm thick, and 64 to 140mm wide, with 90 x 22mm being a popular section size.

Timber boards vary widely in density. Treated pine is relatively soft and easy to secure, while hardwoods and manufactured composite boards can be much tougher to work with. Stainless steel screws are a good choice for decking as they offer good resistance to the chemicals in treated pine, as well as being highly resistant to corrosion caused by moisture.

If you are securing 90 x 22mm boards, 50mm long screws will usually be enough. If securing 140mm wide boards opt for 65mm screws, because the force of the timber cupping as the boards dry may tear out shorter screws.

In addition to drilling pilot holes, it's worth using 10 or 12g screws instead of 8g in very hard timber.

Some screws, such as the Zenith Quickshot range (itwproline.com.au), not only bore their own pilot hole, but are also self-countersinking, saving you hours of effort.

Driving screws

Sometimes the driver bit can cam out of the screw head, which means it wrenches free and turns without transferring torque to the screw.

Phillips drive is particularly prone to camming out, making it a bad choice for decking screws.

Other factors that make screws cam out are high torque, as required for hardwood decking, and the



fastener material, as stainless steel is softer than high-carbon steel.

To minimise the risk of screws camming out, use square-drive screws, and opt for an impact driver instead of an ordinary cordless drill.

Refinish decking boards

deck is one build that keeps on giving, adding lifestyle benefits and value to the home. Regular maintenance can help quality outdoor timber last for up to 15 years, so it pays to look after your investment.

Giving the deck a thorough going over at the start of summer prepares it for use and uncovers any potential problems that need fixing.

CHECK THE FINISH

Depending on the age and outlook, a good wash down with a stiff bristle broom and mineral turpentine may be enough to revive the timber.

But if it's in a shady position or receives strong, direct sun it may need to be deep-cleaned and refinished.

OILED DECK should be treated with a timber cleaner then re-oiled every six months for best results.

STAINED DECK needs light sanding

STAINED DECK needs light sanding and restaining every two years.



1 CLEAN THE DECK by hosing it down with water, then applying deck cleaner to one square metre at a time.
TIP The cleaner is activated by water.

PAINTED DECK requires light sanding, cleaning and refinishing every few years using a primer and specialised paint.

OIL THE TIMBER

Check an oiled deck twice a year and a stained deck every two years to see if it needs refinishing.

A quick method to use is to splash water on the boards. If it soaks in instead of beading off then it's time to reseal the timber.






2 SCRUB THE SURFACE with a stiff brush then leave the cleaner to soak for 15 minutes without letting it dry out completely. Hose it down to rinse off.





3 FINISH THE DECK with two coats of decking oil using a lambswool pad with a long handle to apply it evenly, leaving the oil to dry between coats.

CHRISTMAS by design

Get out the hot glue gun this festive season to give your home designer style on a DIY budget

his year say goodbye to trees and tradition and create your own Christmas. All you need to give your home a festive feel are basic items from the hardware store.

It's a way to get creative without breaking the budget and in homes where floorspace is at a premium these decorations can't be beaten.

With little more than a hot glue gun and balls of twine you can turn

a tree branch into a rustic chandelier, make a colourful wreath and create a wall-mounted Christmas tree.

You'll need a forked branch about 30mm thick with several smaller limbs. Use one left over from spring pruning or source one from a local arborist. Any smooth-barked tree like crabapple or eucalyptus will work.

Trim the branch with a handsaw, sanding any rough edges. Wrap

a plastic ivy garland around it then add handmade twine baubles and jar lights. You can use live greenery but it will only last a day or two.

The branch is only temporary so use heavy-duty twine to hang it from a hook on a wall or ceiling. Just make sure the fastener is rated to take the weight of the decorated branch.

TIP You can spray-paint the branch to match any colour scheme.



1 PREPARE THE DISPLAY by wrapping greenery around the branch, securing it with hot glue. Roll white twine into balls, securing the ends with glue and attaching a looped hanger, then tie them to the branch.



2 MAKE THE LIGHTS by filling jars with silver beads and adding a tea light to each one. Light them with a stove lighter, then hang them on the branch. **TIP** For a safer option, use flameless, battery-powered LED candles.



Decorate for the season using a few common DIY tools and materials.




Ball wreath

Make a colourful wreath to hang on an internal door by decorating a foam ring with balls of twine.

You'll need a 340mm polystyrene wreath base, about \$6, from a supplier like Craft 4 Less (craft4less.com.au).

To make the balls, use Grunt twine in different colours and thicknesses, about \$4 a roll (usegrunt.com).

Secure the balls to the wreath base with generous amounts of hot glue, handling the gun carefully to avoid burns, then attach a hanger.



10 ROLL THE TWINE into balls, making four different sizes and securing the ends with hot glue. For a 340mm wreath you will need about seven 100mm, 20 x 80mm, 10 x 50mm and 15 x 30mm balls.



2 ATTACH THE BALLS to the foam wreath using a hot glue gun, starting with the 100mm balls. Add the 80 and the 50mm balls, filling any gaps with the 30mm. Let it dry then glue a jute hanger to the back of the wreath.



Twine tree

Deck the wall and free up the floor with a tree made from balls of twine attached to removable hangers.


You'll need Command Mini Hooks with clear strips that hold 225g each, about \$14 (commandbrand.com.au).

Make a template by marking the outline of a tree shape on the wall using painter's tape. Roll jute and coloured twine into 50mm balls, thread the twine ends through small plastic rings then secure to the

ball with hot glue.

Measure the distance between the balls on the wall, allowing about 100mm in between.

Follow the packet instructions to attach the hooks on the marked positions. Hang the balls on the hooks by the rings and remove the tape.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

Make a designer bowl with just a few twists and snips then decorate it with paint and beads in bright colours

irework bowls are kitchen classics but often come with high price tags at antique and decorator shops.

This one can be made in just a weekend for the price of the wire, seed beads and metal paint.

Seed beads can be found at craft shops, but for a budget option just recycle some old jewellery and buy tie wire from a hardware store.

If you have trouble finding the exact size you can go up and down a little in thickness, using 2.9 or 3.2mm wire instead of 3mm or 1.57mm in place of 1.6mm. It is sometimes sold by gauge rather than in millimetres, and the higher the gauge, the finer the wire.

For 3mm wire use 8 or 9 gauge, 14 gauge for 1.6mm, 19 gauge for 0.9mm and 21 gauge for 0.7mm.

The only tools you need to make the bowl are wire cutters to snip the wire to length and pliers to help bend it into shape, plus a round bowl to use as a size guide for the bowl rim and separate base with feet.

Painting galvanised wire

The zinc coating on galvanised wire stops paint from adhering. To finish the bowl, first treat the wire to provide adhesion for the topcoat.

When weaving the bowl, leave two gaps for the beadwork, adding it after the wire has been painted.

WASH THE BOWL with an alkaline water-based cleanser with a pH of at least 11. Rinse with clean water and leave overnight to dry thoroughly, or longer in humid conditions.

APPLY A PRIMER using an etch or zinc-rich primer then spray with two coats of enamel formulated for metal,

letting it dry between coats.
TIP Test paint a small area,
let it dry then apply masking
tape. If the paint comes
away with the tape, clean
and prime the bowl again.









MAKE THE WIRE BOWL








2 BEND THE WIRE into a 120mm-long foot, take it around the circle by one-third, make another foot then repeat. Use wire cutters to trim the wire to the start of the circle.




3 FINISH THE FEET by forming a curl from each 120mm long wire foot by gently separating and bending the two strands. Adjust all three feet so the bowl base sits flat.




OREATE THE RIM of the bowl by wrapping a length of 3mm wire around an object of the required diameter. Cut the wire with wire cutters and tie the ends of the rim with 0.7mm wire.




6 MAKE AN ARC from 3mm wire, cut it to length plus 50mm and bend 25mm arms at 90° on each end using pliers. Position the arc on the rim and secure with 0.7mm wire.




6 SHAPE THE BOWL by adding two arcs bent at the midpoint into a 60° angle. Attach the arms to the rim of the bowl and join the arcs at the midpoints using 0.7mm wire.




TACH THE WIRE for weaving the bowl by cutting three lengths of 0.7mm wire to five times as long as the arcs. Twist each wire around two arcs, leaving equal tails.




3 START A SPIRAL of 1.6mm wire in the centre, weaving the 0.7mm wire tails around the arcs. Finish the bowl base then twist and cut off the wire to leave a gap for the beadwork.




THREAD THE BEADS onto lengths of 0.9mm wire. Finish weaving the bowl, leaving another gap for beadwork. Tie off and trim all wires, attaching the beadwork with 0.7mm wire.



MAKE THE LOOPS for the rim of the bowl by tightly coiling a length of 1.6mm wire around a broom handle or 18mm dowel, keeping tension on the wire as you go.



1) SLIDE THE WIRE off the broom handle and gently stretch the loops out between two hands. **TIP** To flatten the looped wire, sit it under heavy books overnight.



● FINISH THE BOWL by attaching the loops to the rim at regular intervals with 0.7mm wire and trim any excess. Neaten all wire joints and secure the base to the bowl with 0.7mm wire.

Making a wire heart



Create a mini garden sculpture from scrap metal like this rustic heart made from mild steel wire, which is iron containing a small percentage of carbon. You can find rusted mild steel wire at a scrap yard, buy it new at the hardware store and let it weather or use galvanised wire finished with a special rust-effect paint.

To make the heart, form the shape using 2.5mm wire. Wind 1.6mm wire around an 18mm dowel, slide it off and twist the loops around the heart using pliers, letting the loops open as you work. Secure the ends to the heart with 1.6mm wire, cutting off any excess.

RECLAIMED TIMBER TREE

Get festive with DIY and turn offcuts into a seasonal decoration that will last for many holidays to come


his year, instead of buying a live Christmas tree that will end up on the back of a council truck by January, make your own.

Use odds and ends from other DIY projects to create an individual, eye-catching festive decoration.

For the branches we used scraps of hardwood decking boards, a pine frame from a large canvas and a few scraps of framing timber. The branches were threaded onto a 600 x 10mm dowel, with pine offcuts used as spacers and the tree base.

Measure and mark the reclaimed timber into different lengths for the branches and spacers, ensuring that each branch has a matching pair.

You can leave the timber in a raw, unfinished state, or apply two coats of oil or beeswax before assembling.




1 Make the branches
Cut the branches and spacers to
length with a mitresaw. Sand all the
pieces with 100 grit then 150 grit
abrasive paper, smoothing over
rough ends and corners. Find and
mark the centre of each branch.



2 Drill the holes

Make pilot holes in the centre of each branch using a 3mm bit, then drill with a 10mm bit, taking care to keep the drill vertical. Test-fit the branches to the dowel. Drill a hole in the base and secure the dowel with adhesive.



3 Make the tree
3 Thread the branches onto the dowel, adding spacers. Not all the branches need a spacer between them, judge what looks best as you go. Leave 50mm of dowel extending from the top for a star or angel. Add decorations.

Great ideas for putting up, taking down and packing away your festive decorations

A nyone who enjoys decorating the house and tree will love these great solutions for storing and managing decorations.

Use these techniques to put up string lights and pack them away to keep them damage-free, so you can hang them up next season without spending hours untangling the cords or replacing broken bulbs.



In the bag

An easy way to store holiday lights according to usage is to put each string in a separate plastic bag with the location marked on it.

Make sure the lights are untangled and the bulbs intact before putting them in the bags, storing them in a safe spot.

Take a stand

If you use dozens of light strings each year, storage can be tricky.

To make stands for the lights, cut timber to fit the bases of plastic storage tubs and attach dowels 50mm from the ends using screws.

Wrap the string lights around the dowels in a figure-eight pattern and put the stands in the tubs.

You'll be amazed how many light strings you can store on the stands without tangles or damage.





On the cards

Here's a simple way to recycle old boxes and keep string lights from getting tangled when in storage.

Cut pieces of cardboard into the shape of flat spools with slots on the ends, like the type used for twine, ribbon and thread.

Wrap one light string around each storage card, label them and put in a plastic tub until next year.



Off the hook

Putting up and taking down lights on a tall outdoor or indoor tree can be dangerous. Make it safer by using a paint roller extension pole or broom handle with a hook.

Cut the hook from a wire coathanger or make one from heavy-gauge wire, securing it to one end of the pole with duct tape to stop it sliding around.

TIP The pole hook is also useful for hanging ornaments up high.




Wrap it up

When dismantling an artificial Christmas tree, use the ribbons it was originally packed with to tie up the boughs of each section.

When the ribbons wear out and you need substitute ties, use rolls of self-adhesive bandage to wrap the branches for storage.

Strong and re-usable they'll do the job without damaging the tree or breaking the budget.



FESTIVE LIGHTING

Make any outdoor area more appealing this summer with affordable and efficient backyard illuminations

ecorative lighting is an easy and effective way to turn an ordinary outdoor area into a more intimate and inviting space to enjoy during the festive season.

Decks, courtyards and gardens illuminated with decorative lighting are far more welcoming on warm summer nights than yards that are dark and gloomy, or lit with harsh fluorescent bulbs.

Advances in technology have reduced both the purchase price and ongoing costs of outdoor lights. Efficient LED lights use a fraction of the power of standard bulbs and can save hundreds of dollars over time.

Small areas like courtyards benefit from subtle lights such as torches and lanterns tucked into planters, or hung from lattice. Citronella candles can be placed in decorative holders for an attractive light that deters mosquitoes.

Hanging and wall-mounted lights work best in larger areas such as backyards. Large standing lights can also be used effectively in these areas to make a dramatic statement.

SAVE MONEY WITH SOLAR

Solar powered lights are a smart outdoor lighting solution. They feature

small built-in solar panels and are not connected to mains power, meaning they have no running costs and are easy to install DIY.

Solar lights require at least six hours of sunlight per day to charge the internal batteries that power LEDs.

Most models have sensors that activate the lights at dusk.

Solar-powered path lights are completely self-contained with no wires. They are ideal for lining paths, paved areas and garden beds and can easily be repositioned as required.







Milk carton candles

settings, use a utility knife to make rectangular cutouts in the front of one-litre milk cartons. Cover the cartons with wrapping paper secured at the joins and folds with PVA adhesive, piercing ventilation holes in the back. Position glass holders with tealight candles in the cartons.



Paper bag path lights
Light the way to the party with path lighting. Make cutouts on one face of white paper bags using a utility knife. Score 60mm lines on lengths of 80mm wide paper and secure to the inside of the bag tops with PVA adhesive. Position the bags along a pathway, adding a candle in a 150mm tall glass holder to each one.



Wrapping-paper lanterns

Decorate for festive parties with seasonal lanterns. Cut wrapping paper to fit around glass candle holders with 10mm extra in length, folding each piece of paper in half lengthways. Score 30mm lines along the fold line with a utility knife then secure the papers around glass candle holders using double-sided tape.



Hanging tealight tins

For ambient garden lighting, hang candle holders from a tree. Use an eyelet punch to make decorative holes in tin cans then add two hanging holes 10mm from the rim. Thread the hanging holes with galvanised tie wire and secure crepe paper tails to the bases with Super Glue. Add tealight candles in glass holders to the tins and hang up.






For a real DIY Aussie feast, cook a traditional turkey, glazed ham, grilled prawns and fruit cake in the backyard

PREPARATION TIME 30 mins COOKING TIME 3 hours SERVES 6 to 8

INGREDIENTS

1 x 7kg whole fresh turkey 2 Tbsp olive oil 1/3 cup plain flour 2 cups chicken stock 1/2 cup sherry


STUFFING

40g butter, roughly chopped
Extra 2 Tbsp olive oil
1 Spanish chorizo, finely chopped
1 large brown onion, finely chopped
3 garlic cloves, crushed
2 tsp smoked paprika
½ tsp saffron threads
Sea salt flakes
Freshly ground black pepper
8 cups white breadcrumbs
3 tsp dried thyme
1 lemon, juiced and rind finely grated
2 eggs, whisked



- PREHEAT THE BARBECUE to medium heat, about 180°C. Line a large roasting pan with baking paper.
- TO MAKE THE STUFFING put the butter and oil in a frying pan over a medium heat. When the butter has melted, add the chorizo, onion and garlic. Cook, stirring occasionally, for eight minutes or until the chorizo is golden and onion soft. Add the paprika, saffron, salt and pepper and cook for one minute. Leave to cool. Put the chorizo mixture, breadcrumbs, thyme, lemon rind, quarter cup of juice and eggs in a bowl. Stir until combined.
- 3 FILL THE FRONT and large cavities of the turkey with stuffing. Secure the legs with kitchen twine and tuck the wings under the body. Put the turkey in the prepared roasting pan. Drizzle with the oil and season with sea salt flakes and freshly ground black pepper.
- ROAST THE TURKEY with the hood down for three hours or until cooked through when tested in the thickest part of a thigh with a bamboo skewer. If the juices run clear the turkey is cooked. If juices are pink, cook a bit longer. Transfer the turkey to a serving platter and cover to keep warm.
- S TO MAKE THE GRAVY drain the pan juices, return a quarter cup to the roasting pan and put over a medium heat on the barbecue grill. Sprinkle over the flour, whisk to combine and continue whisking for three minutes or until mixture is golden. Slowly add the stock and sherry, whisk to combine and continue whisking until the mixture comes to the boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer for three minutes or until gravy has thickened. Strain through a fine sieve, season and pour into a jug. Garnish the turkey with wilted thyme and serve with the gravy on the side. ➤







Classic and festive, ham is a crowd pleaser that makes for very popular leftovers the next day

PREPARATION TIME 30 mins COOKING TIME 1 hour 25 mins SERVES 10 to 12

INGREDIENTS

1 cup firmly packed brown sugar 1 cup orange marmalade ½ cup bourbon 1 Tbsp Dijon mustard 8kg whole leg of ham on the bone 1 Tbsp whole cloves

- 1 PREHEAT THE BARBECUE on low to medium heat, about 160°C. Line a large roasting pan with baking paper and add a wire rack.
- POR THE GLAZE put the sugar, marmalade, bourbon and mustard in a deep saucepan and stir over a medium heat until the sugar is dissolved and the mixture comes to the boil. Reduce the heat to low and simmer for five minutes. Cool.
- 3 PREPARE THE HAM for glazing. Put it on a large chopping board and cut around the shank of the ham in a decorative zigzag pattern about 100mm from the end of the shank. Remove the rind from the ham by running your thumb around the edge under the skin at the widest end and gently pulling the rind back over the shank. Discard the skin.
- Q CUT A DIAMOND PATTERN into the fat of the ham using a small sharp knife. Put the ham on the wire rack in the prepared roasting pan.
- S BRUSH THE GLAZE generously over the ham. Insert a clove into the centre of each diamond. Roast in the barbecue for 40 minutes, brush with glaze and cook for a further 40 minutes or until ham is glossy, sticky and golden. Transfer the ham to a large serving platter and stand for 10 minutes before slicing. ➤


INGREDIENTS

- 1 garlic clove, crushed
- 1 Tbsp fish sauce
- 3 tsp caster sugar
- 1.2kg large green prawns, tails on, peeled and deveined

DIPPING SAUCE


1/2 cup lemon juice
Extra 2 Tbsp fish sauce
40g palm sugar, grated
1 long red chilli, finely chopped
2 garlic cloves, crushed
1 coriander root, finely chopped

- ① CUT THE ROOTS off the coriander and wash thoroughly. Remove the sprigs and set aside. Finely chop two coriander roots and put in a large bowl. Add the eschallot, garlic, fish sauce and caster sugar. Stir until combined. Add the prawns, cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes.
- MAKE THE DIPPING SAUCE by combining the lemon juice, fish sauce, palm sugar, chilli, garlic and coriander root. Transfer to a serving bowl.
- 3 HEAT THE GRILL or hotplate of a barbecue on medium heat. When hot, add the marinated prawns and cook for two minutes on each side or until cooked through. Transfer to a platter, garnish with coriander sprigs and serve with the dipping sauce on the side.



SHERLOCK WHEELBARROWS





It wouldn't be Christmas without a fruit cake but forget slaving in the kitchen because this recipe can be done on the barbie, including the brandy butter icing

PREPARATION TIME 40 mins + the standing time
COOKING TIME 2½ hours
MAKES 1 cake

INGREDIENTS

1.7kg dried mixed fruit

1 cup brandy

1 orange, juiced and rind finely grated

250g butter, softened

1 cup firmly packed dark brown sugar

3 tsp vanilla extract

4 eggs

½ cup plum jam

2 cups plain flour

1/2 cup self raising flour

3 tsp ground cinnamon

3 tsp mixed spice

1 tsp nutmeg

1 tsp ground cloves

Extra 1/2 cup brandy

Extra 180g butter, softened 1¼ cups pure icing sugar, sifted Extra 1 tsp vanilla extract

1 PUT THE FRUIT into a large bowl. Add the brandy, orange rind and half a cup of orange juice. Cover and stand for at least two hours or overnight.

PREHEAT THE BARBECUE on low to medium heat, about 160°C. Grease a deep 22cm square cake tin and line with two layers of baking paper. Put the butter, sugar and vanilla in a bowl and beat with an electric beater until light and creamy. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add the jam and mix to combine.

3 ADD THE BUTTER MIXTURE to the fruit mixture and stir with a large metal spoon until well combined. Sift over the flours and spices and stir until combined. Spoon the cake mixture into the prepared tin, smooth the top with the back of a wet spoon and tap the tin on a flat surface to settle the mixture.

4 BAKE THE CAKE in the barbecue with the hood down for two and a half hours or until a skewer comes out clean when inserted in the centre. Remove from the barbecue and pour two tablespoons of the extra brandy over the cake. Cool the tin on a wire rack. When completely cold remove the cake from the tin.

S ICE THE CAKE by beating the extra butter and icing sugar with an electric mixer for 10 minutes or until light and creamy. Add the remaining brandy and vanilla and beat until combined. Cover the cold cake with the brandy butter icing. TIP The un-iced cake will keep for up to three months if stored in an airtight container and refrigerated.

INGREDIENTS

11/2 cups cranberry juice 4 large limes 1/4 cup caster sugar 250g punnet strawberries, halved 4 stalks fresh mint 750ml sparkling mineral or soda water, chilled Ice, to serve Mint leaves, to serve

POUR THE CRANBERRY JUICE into a large jug. Juice two of the limes and add to the jug with the caster sugar, stirring until the sugar has dissolved. Thinly slice the remaining limes and add to the jug with the strawberries. Pour chilled sparkling mineral or soda water into the jug and stir. Add the ice and top with mint leaves then serve.

Prawn skewers with lime mayo



These simple prawn skewers work equally well as a main meal or a tasty appetiser. For the best flavour and texture, purchase fresh prawns then peel and devein them at home.

SOAK THE SKEWERS in water and set aside, then blanch the snow peas and beans for 20 seconds in boiling water, drain and set aside to cool.

TIP Prawns will be cooked once they turn orange on the outside.

PREPARATION TIME 20 mins COOKING TIME 10 mins SERVES 4

TOOLS.

Bamboo skewers Tongs

INGREDIENTS

Salt and pepper

32 king prawns, peeled and deveined 100g baby spinach, washed 100g snow peas, trimmed, halved 100g green beans, trimmed, quartered 3 egg yolks 1 tsp Dijon mustard 2 limes, 1 juiced, 1 quartered 300ml olive oil

• PREHEAT THE BARBECUE to medium heat, about 180°C. Put the baby spinach, snow peas and green beans in a large salad bowl and set aside.

MAKE THE LIME MAYO by whisking together the egg yolks, mustard and lime juice until light and creamy. Slowly add one teaspoon of olive oil at a time while whisking continuously, season and add the zest of half a lime.

PUT FOUR PRAWNS on each skewer and cook on the barbecue for three minutes on each side, turning only once.

ORESS THE GREENS with a squeeze of lime juice and a drizzle of oil, then season with salt and pepper and divide between four plates. Add two prawn skewers to each plate and serve with the lime mayo on the side.

Moroccan roast lamb



A leg of lamb is not the most common meal to cook on a barbecue but with a closed hood acting as an oven, baking and roasting is simple.

CHECK THE TEMPERATURE by inserting a digital thermometer into the meat to determine when it is cooked. Rare is below 55°C, medium is 65°C and well done is above 75°C.

TIP Serve lamb with couscous and roasted sweet potatoes on the side.

PREPARATION TIME 15 mins COOKING TIME 90 mins SERVES 8

TOOLS

Wire roasting rack Enamel tray Digital thermometer

INGREDIENTS

2.4kg leg of lamb

1 lemon, juiced and zested

1 Tbsp dry oregano

1 tsp paprika

1 tsp chilli powder

3 Tbsp olive oil

1 PREHEAT THE BARBECUE to

medium heat, about 180°C. To make the marinade for the lamb, put the lemon juice, lemon zest, oregano, paprika, chilli powder and olive oil in a small bowl and mix to combine.

PREPARE THE LAMB by cutting several small slits all over the leg, then use your hands to rub the marinade into the meat, pushing it into the slits with your fingers.

OPUT THE LAMB LEG on a wire roasting rack with an enamel drip tray underneath. Partially fill the tray with water to 20mm deep, to stop it being burned by drops of fat.

② COOK THE LAMB in the barbecue with the hood closed for about 90 minutes, using a thermometer to check the meat is cooked. Let the lamb rest for 10 minutes, carve and serve. ▶

Thai marinated snapper



Whole fish tastes fresher, lasts longer and is often better value than individual fillets. Cooking it whole on a barbecue is simpler than it seems and a 1kg fish can easily feed three to four people.

USE A FISH GRILLER to make it easy to turn the fish without it falling apart. Always wear gloves when handling the fish griller as it will be very hot. TIP Serve with a side of steamed Asian vegetables such as baby bok choy.

PREPARATION TIME 15 mins COOKING TIME 20 mins SERVES 4

TOOLS

Fish griller Spatula Gloves Tongs


INGREDIENTS

1kg whole snapper, scaled and cleaned

- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 Tbsp ginger, finely chopped
- 1 Tbsp fresh chilli, finely chopped
- 1 Tbsp coriander, finely chopped
- 1 lime
- 3 Tbsp olive oil
- PREHEAT THE BARBECUE to medium heat, about 180°C. Lightly oil a fish griller.
- PREPARE THE FISH by trimming the tail and fins so they don't burn. Make

small incisions across the body spaced 10mm apart on each side of the fish to allow the marinade to seep through.

- MAKE THE MARINADE by combining the garlic, ginger, chilli, coriander, zest of half the lime and olive oil, rubbing it into the fish. Cut the zested lime half into wedges, put them inside the fish and refrigerate for 30 minutes.
- QPUT THE SNAPPER in the fish griller and cook it on the barbecue over direct heat for about 10 minutes on each side. Remove the snapper from the fish griller wearing gloves and using tongs and a spatula, then put it on a platter and serve with lime wedges.

Beer can chicken



Using a can of beer to cook a chicken on the barbecue results in delicious crispy skin on the outside and moist, flavourful meat on the inside. Ginger beer, chicken stock or even a can of baked beans make great alternatives.

OPEN THE BEER and have a mouthful, then place the can into the beer can rack on top of an enamel drip tray.

TIP Chicken is cooked if juices run clear when the meat is pierced with a skewer.

PREPARATION TIME 15 mins COOKING TIME 60 to 90 mins SERVES 4

T00LS

Chicken rack Enamel drip tray Digital thermometer

1 medium sized chicken

INGREDIENTS

375ml can of beer
3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
3 shallots, finely chopped
1 Tbsp oregano, finely chopped
1 tsp rosemary, finely chopped
½ tsp chilli flakes
½ tsp coarse ground black pepper
110ml extra virgin olive oil
Salt to taste

• PREHEAT THE BARBECUE to medium heat, about 180°C. Trim excess fat from

the neck and cavity of the chicken and cover the wingtips with foil.

MAKE THE SEASONING by mixing the garlic, shallots, oregano, rosemary, chilli and pepper, then add the oil and salt. Rub the seasoning on and under the chicken skin, and in the cavity.

3 SIT THE CHICKEN on the beer can and cook with the barbecue hood closed for 60 to 90 minutes. Chicken is ready when a digital thermometer inserted into the thickest part of the thigh reads 75°C.

Rest for five minutes then serve.

BARBECUES

Choose gas, charcoal or wood and get grilling with the latest technology for cooking outdoors

COOK ALFRESCO

Barbecuing outdoors is one of life's great pleasures and, depending on the size of your backyard and how much you want to spend, there are many options from which to choose. GAS BARBECUES are incredibly convenient, available in both built-in and portable versions, and are easy to clean. They're often pricier than charcoal barbies, but create less mess. CHARCOAL BARBECUES are, according to some purists, the only option. They need to be manually lit, take more time to heat up, and are more difficult to keep at a constant temperature.

The flavour of the food is said to be better so if you like a smoky taste, they're worth the effort. PIZZA OVENS are a great way to bring entertaining outside, and an authentic wood-fired pizza at home will be a popular choice.

As well as pizzas, you can cook roasts, vegies and even desserts in them. They need to be preheated for an hour or two before cooking, and a supply of firewood is crucial.



*COOKING WITH GAS


Gas barbecues are quick to heat up, fuel-efficient and easy to use.

To start, open the valve on the gas cylinder all the way. Turn the burner knobs to high then press the ignition button in and hold the knob for about five seconds until the burners are lit.

Wait a few minutes until the grill or plate is fully heated then scrape any remnants of previous meals off the grill. Allow this to burn off completely, leaving the surfaces sterile and ready for cooking.

Once you have finished cooking, leave the burners on for five minutes to burn off any food left on the grill.

Turn the gas cylinder completely off to empty the gas lines, and only turn the burners off once the flames have been extinguished completely. TIP If any hose appears damaged or cracked, it should be replaced to avoid dangerous gas leaks.



TEMPERATURE

DIRECT AND INDIRECT HEAT

Having several burners gives you a range of options to tailor the cooking method to the type of food.

DIRECT COOKING involves frying or grilling food directly over the source of heat. This is ideal for sausages, steaks, fish and anything less than about 50mm thick. Keep all the

burners lit under the cooking surface you are using. INDIRECT COOKING is a similar

process to baking in the oven and is suitable for thicker meat.

To cook indirectly, turn either the middle or side burners off and position the food over the unlit portion of the grill.

* LPG VS NATURAL GAS

If you have access to natural gas, consider connecting it to the barbie. It's much cheaper than LPG (liquefied petroleum gas), there are no bottles to replace and you never have to worry about running out of gas.

In most cases, adapting the barbie to work with natural gas is a simple matter of adjusting the valves and changing the regulator, but these modifications must be made by a qualified gasfitter.



*HOW MUCH GAS IS LEFT?

To ensure you never run out of gas, attach a pressure gauge to show how much is left in the bottle.

These can indicate leaks and typically have an automatic shut-off function in case the hose ruptures or accidentally detaches.

The old-fashioned way to measure gas levels is to manually weigh the gas bottle when full and again when empty to be able to estimate how much gas is left.

TIP Never store gas bottles beneath an unventilated built-in barbecue.

*BE READY FOR ACTION

New barbies need to be cleaned before use, as does every grill after cooking. Season a new barbecue by burning it on high heat for an hour. Turn it off, let it cool slightly, then rub the cooking surfaces with a cloth dipped in cooking oil.

INTENSIVE CLEANING

Salts and marinades can damage metal so clean them as soon as possible after cooking by lighting the burners for a few minutes, then turning off the heat and scraping the surfaces thoroughly.

Give the barbie a serious clean at least once a year. Lay the grill and hotplate on newspaper, spray with oven cleaner and leave for 10 minutes before scrubbing with a scourer.

Rinse, dry and replace them, then apply a coating of cooking oil to protect against rust.

SCRAPE OFF THE GRIME

There's nothing worse than opening the lid of the barbie to find the cooking surfaces encrusted with bits of food so keep it clean for hassle-free cooking.



CLEAN THE GRILL with a wire brush after each use, brushing the top and sides of the bars, letting remnants fall through onto the fat tray for collection and removal later.



USE A SCRAPER to remove fat and food residue from the hotplate once the barbecue has cooled.

TIP If it's going into storage, spray the cooking surfaces with cooking oil.

* GRILLING OVER CHARCOAL

Barbecue purists argue charcoal grills give the best flavour, although advocates of cooking with gas debate this, claiming that gas allows meat to retain its natural taste.

According to Mark Kleiner, Product Manager at Mayo Hardware, 'The mechanism that produces true barbecue flavour is the smoke.

'Charcoal, even though it is just smouldering, still produces smoke, and this cannot be replicated by cooking on a gas barbecue.'

Cooking meat on a charcoal grill also tends to take longer, so the food has more time to be infused with the smoky flavour.

Another advantage is that the briquettes can be moved around to control the temperature precisely in specific parts of the grill.



*ELEMENTS OF A CHARCOAL BARBECUE



RAPID LIGHT

Arguably the fastest and easiest way to get briquettes burning is to use a Looftlighter, a high-tech yet low-cost invention that takes only about two minutes to get the grill ready for cooking.


The mains-powered element at the tip gets the charcoal glowing, then a high-speed stream of air spreads heat until the briquettes are ashen and ready to cook with.

*HOW TO START BRIQUETTES

If you prefer the old-fashioned way of using naked flame to start the charcoal, you have several options. FIRELIGHTERS are efficient and safe fuel-packed cubes, but they need to combust completely before cooking otherwise they will infuse the food with a kerosene aftertaste. LIGHTER FLUID is a more dangerous option, as some contain substances that are harmful to ingest, and they can potentially cause an explosion. KINDLING is a natural way to start any fire, but it takes a bit of work to split wood down to an effective size. **BARBECUE STARTERS** are metal tins that you fill with briquettes then position over burning firelighters. Once the charcoal turns the colour of light ash, tip it out of the starter and into the barbie.



*COOKING A STEAK

Never cut steak to see if it's done, as cutting it will let the juices escape, making the meat dry and tough. To check, press the middle of the meat with tongs and compare its firmness with your face.


Poke your face with your fingers, not the tongs. The meat should feel like your cheek for rare, chin for medium or forehead for well done.

COOK THE STEAK for two to three minutes each side if you want it rare, and six to seven minutes each side for well done, turning often.

REST THE MEAT after cooking to let the juices spread evenly through it, ensuring it is tender and moist.

Cover the steak loosely in foil and leave it to stand before serving for about eight minutes if rare and about four minutes if well done.

CHOOSE MARBLED CUTS of steak, as opposed to leaner cuts, for the richest flavour. For a healthier alternative, trim the fat off and opt for cuts with less marbling.



WOOD-FIRED OVEN

*THE VERSATILE WOOD-FIRED OVEN

Often called pizza ovens, wood-fired ovens can cook much more than just pizzas. You can use them to bake bread, roast meat and vegies, even cook desserts to perfection.

Handyman Managing editor Lee Dashiell says, 'Start by setting up the fire in the front or middle of the floor of the oven. This will get the warmth through the floor tiles where the cooking is done.

As with a fireplace, fire needs air to flow underneath and through it to create a draught.

To light the fire, position three logs about 100mm in diameter parallel on the oven floor.

Scrunch up some newspaper and push it between the logs. Stack twigs on top and add more logs in crisscrossed layers.

Light the fire and leave it to burn for 45 minutes, then add more small logs on top. Allow it continue to burn for another 45 minutes before beginning to cook.

GET COOKING

The easiest way to tell if the oven has warmed up sufficiently is to look at the bricks on the inside of the roof. Once they start turning white, you are ready to cook.

Use a hoe to push the fire to the back of the oven, then add a few more pieces of wood and sweep the coals on the floor to the back.

After another two minutes, it's time to cook pizzas. If you are cooking a roast, wait 20 minutes to prevent it from browning too fast.

'I once cooked 25 pizzas for a party, having had a production line in place,' says Lee.

'We've also cooked our entire Christmas feast, including the desserts, this way. The richness of flavour you get from a wood-fired oven is second to none.'







*PIZZA DOUGH

Authentic Italian pizza has a crispy base. This recipe makes one pizza, so multiply the ingredients by the number of pizzas required.

INGREDIENTS


1 tsp dry yeast ¼ cup lukewarm water 1 cup Molini Pizzuti Fine 00 flour 1 Tbsp olive oil ¼ Tbsp salt

OPENEAT THE OVEN then dissolve the yeast in the water with two tablespoons of the flour, leaving it until it bubbles. Combine with the remaining ingredients in a bowl, mix thoroughly and knead for about 10 minutes or until soft and flexible. REST THE DOUGH in an oiled, covered bowl, keeping it in a warm place for about an hour to double in size. Knead the dough, then roll it out on a floured surface to form a 200mm diameter circle. **8** FLOUR THE OVEN FLOOR and top the dough with a variety of ingredients of your choice, then

slide it into the oven using a pizza shovel. Cook until the base starts

to brown, the toppings are golden

and the cheese is melted.



The couple brought a keen eye for detail and passion for quality to the project. They worked hard to ensure the home would be both an impressive achievement and a wonderful place to live.



The decorating style has been chosen to reflect the home's metamorphosis, combining modern elegance with sentimental vintage pieces and well-placed artistic touches.


An Italian designer sofa sits where there were once pews, and is teamed with an antelope-hide chair.

Vaulted ceilings add a sense of drama, and increase the feeling of spaciousness in a property with a relatively small footprint.



Bare concrete, dead garden beds, a threadbare lawn and a decaying pergola are the telltale signs of years of neglect. It's time this place had a serious makeover.

THE CHALLENGE

Something needs to be done about the red brick walls. The style is very dated

and the stained masonry makes the whole backyard look gloomy.

The bare concrete is overgrown with weeds and looks disconnected from the equally neglected lawn.

The broken timber fence and mass of scrappy bushes to the right all need to go. We can make far better use of that space by building a modern deck.

Finally, the Hills Hoist has to move and the grass needs to be revitalised if we're going to turn this yard into a functional outdoor area.

Tricks of the trade

■ LEVEL THE SURFACE and

- improve the soil before laying a new lawn. Hire a bobcat to excavate the area then lay the turf.

 CHOOSE SUITABLE PLANTS for
- the garden, especially if it receives full sun during the summer months. Low-maintenance native species are ideal.
- RAISE THE DECK to the same level as the interior floor, creating a seamless transition between inside and outside.

The six secrets of success

11 CLEAR THE MESS

When it comes to revamping a neglected backyard like this one, it's best to start fresh. Removing the broken paling fence, the unsightly chimney, the rickety pergola, the mess of bushes and the ugly concrete slab results in a clean slate to work with.

4 PAINT THE CONCRETE

Paving paint will transform the bare concrete path, and is matched as closely as possible to the colour of the house render. This is a more cost-effective alternative to paving. The Colorbond fence also needs a coat of paint for a unified colour scheme.

REVAMP THE LAWN

Moving the clothesline to the end of the yard means it's no longer the focal point. The lawn is in a bad state, so if the budget allows, laying new turf is the best option. Reseeding the lawn is simpler and less expensive, but the end result will take longer to achieve.

S BUILD THE DECK

The dead zone to the right of the house will become a deck. By using Handi Blocks and timber joists as a decking support structure, we'll avoid having to dig footings or build piers, and just lay hardwood decking on top. Outdoor furniture completes the look.

RENDER THE WALLS

For the red bricks, a base coat of traditional sand and cement render can be used with a skim coat of Rockcote textured render on top, significantly slashing the rendering bill. You can tint to virtually any colour, and a pale grey will be ideal for this home.

6 ADD GARDEN BEDS

Simple garden beds will complete the makeover, and westringia or rosemary finished with decorative woodchips will do the trick. A timber screen at the side of the house replaces the neglected paling fence, adding greenery and privacy.

ow that summer's finally here, give your hound a lifestyle upgrade with this colourful new home inspired by the famous huts of Victoria's Brighton beach on Port Phillip Bay.

Constructed from treated pine framing clad in fence paling slats, this doggy holiday home provides shelter and comfort all year round.

The dog house is 900mm wide and 600mm deep, suitable for a small to medium dog, and has a lightweight skillion roof which is removable for easy access when cleaning.

The cheerful design also features a sun deck, which is an independent structure that can be easily removed if space in your yard is tight.

For maximum resistance to the elements, we used colours from the Dulux range in low-sheen exterior acrylic, which can be applied directly to raw timber without priming.

CUT THE PARTS

Use a sliding compound mitresaw to cut the parts, with 15° bevels on the side slats and top cleats. After securing the front and back side slats, mark cut lines for the remaining side slats from the top cleats and cut them as you go.

To mark the arched top of the door on the front slats, trace around a saucepan lid or similar object and cut out using a jigsaw.

Cut the roofing to size from an 1800 x 810 x 0.8mm sheet of Suntuf polycarbonate roofing in Greca profile, about \$20 (palram.com.au). Cut the corners off the front and back barges at 45° for a decorative look.

Trace around your dog's food and water bowls in the corners of the sun deck and use a jigsaw to cut out recesses to house the bowls.



Construct the bases

BASE FRONT

Make two identical base frames for the dog house and the sun deck. Drill pilot holes and position the base rails between the front and back rails, securing with screws. Attach the decking boards edge to edge on the top of each frame with screws.

Build the side frames

Use a sliding compound mitresaw to cut the front and back side slats with a 15° bevel at the top, securing them to the base frame with screws and using a paling offcut as a spacer. Cut the top cleats with opposing 15° bevels at the ends and secure with screws.

Add the top rails

Secure the top rails between the top cleats using screws. Add the outermost front and back slats flush with the edge of the front and back side slats, using a paling offcut as a spacer. Add two middle side slats on each side with 67mm gaps, securing with screws.



Attach the slats

Secure four more front and back slats, spaced with 66mm gaps. Attach the outer side slats with equal overlap, securing through the inner slats, then add the remaining front and back slats. TIP Mark the exact cut line on the side slats from the top cleat.




Build the roof

Clamp the purlins to the top rails with a 30mm overhang on the front and back then attach the side barges to the ends with screws. Secure the front and back barges to the purlins and side barges with screws. Mark a door on the front slats and cut out with a jigsaw.



Finish the dog house

Use a paintbrush to apply two coats of exterior acrylic in colours of your choice. Use aviation shears to cut a polycarbonate roofing sheet to fit then secure to the roof frame with specialised screws. Secure the sun deck to the base frame with screws.

arger breeds of dogs such as Malamutes and German Shepherds are popular pets. But if you have a big dog, or several smaller ones, you may find buying their pet food in bulk is an economic necessity.

This easy DIY dispenser takes the hassle out of feeding any number of hungry canines. It's made from dressed all round (DAR) pine, with masonite backing and Tasmanian oak trim.

To release dry food into your pet's bowl, the dispenser features blast gates,

usually used in dust extraction ducting and available from specialist suppliers.

An acrylic panel on the front shows how much food is left, and it can easily be refilled by opening the hinged lid.

The dispenser is finished with two coats of clear polyurethane and hung on a split batten secured to a masonry wall using screws with wall plugs.

TIP On a stud wall, use heavy-duty plasterboard anchors.

CUT THE PARTS

Use a sliding compound mitresaw to cut the pine to length, and a hacksaw to cut a 610mm length of piano hinge to size. Cut the masonite using a circular saw and straightedge guide.

Use a mitre box with a tenon saw to cut the trim from half-round beading, then cut a concave profile in the end of the centre piece using a coping saw, or file it to shape.

Working with acrylic

For the front of the dispenser, order a 686 x 425 x 3mm sheet of acrylic cut to size, or buy a 900 x 600 x 3mm HandiPanel, \$49, from Bunnings.

To cut it DIY, use a jigsaw at low speed and with the pendulum action off. Ideally, clamp the acrylic between two scraps of sheet material, such as plywood or MDF, to support it.

Work slowly to avoid chipping the acrylic and use slow revs when drilling clearance holes to secure it to the inner sides, cleats and divider.




MAKE THE DISPENSER




1 Set a circular saw baseplate to cut a 22.5° bevel then cut the lid

cut a 22.5° bevel then cut the lid and top cleat along the grain from 285 x 19mm timber, using a clamped straightedge as a guide. Set the saw to 45° and cut the split batten from 140 x 19mm timber.




Add the base and shelf

Use adhesive and screws to secure the base to the divider and the inner sides. Attach the shelf flush with the base of the outer sides, then secure the front cleats and top cleat. Secure the backing using adhesive and panel pins.



Install the blast gates

Mark 100mm diameter openings for the blast gates, centred 100mm in from the ends of the base. Use a 10mm twist bit to make starter holes then cut the openings with a jigsaw. Use construction adhesive to secure the blast gates.



Secure the acrylic

Position the acrylic and mark the mitred ends of the trim. Cut the trim to size as you go, then clamp it in position to drill 1mm diameter pilot holes. Enlarge the holes in the acrylic using a 3mm twist bit, then secure the trim with panel pins.




Laminate the sides

Use adhesive and screws to join the inner and outer sides with the back of each inner side 24mm in from the back of the outer side. Cut the piano hinge to 470mm and clean up the cut end with a file then secure it to the lid using the supplied screws.



Hang the dispenser

Use adhesive and screws to secure the brace and split batten through the backing into the inner sides and divider then secure the hinged lid to the top cleat. On a masonry wall, attach the split batten using screws and wall plugs to hang the dispenser.





DOG POO COMPOSTER

Improve the condition of your soil and nourish the garden by turning canine dung into a high-quality compost

orms are nature's soil improvers, aerating soil and adding rich nutrients. Worm composters are an eco-friendly way to dispose of food scraps, and now you can do the same with your dog's droppings.

The Yardart Pet Poo Composter, \$179 from Tumbleweed, comes with full instructions and everything you need to get started (tumbleweed.com.au).

The compost is ideal for flower beds but shouldn't be used on vegies.

TIP Don't compost a dog's poo for at least a week after it has been wormed.



There are about 6000 species of earthworm worldwide.

Worms commonly referred to as compost worms are *Eisenia foetida* or tiger worms.

They are surface dwellers and can usually be found in leaf litter or decaying organic matter.

Buy two boxes of compost worms from Bunnings for about \$50 each, as the Pet Poo Composter requires 2000 worms to get started.





Prepare the bedding
Break up the bedding block in
a large bucket of water with your
hands, then dig a 400 x 400mm
hole to 320mm deep in the chosen
position in the garden.



2 Condition the soil
Spread a handful of worm farm and composter conditioner inside the hole.
Position the assembled composter in the centre of the hole and check the pedal is just above ground level.



3 Shovel half the presoaked bedding around the composter and half inside. Backfill with soil to cover the lip. Put the worms on top of the bedding and leave for a week before adding dog poo.

ou've nurtured it through the late-winter blues, given it a good spring feed, and made sure it's received enough water.

Now is the time to take a breather and enjoy your lush, healthy and hopefully weed-free grass.

Beyond getting behind the mower every couple of weeks and watering when needed, summer lawn care is pretty simple.

The hot season is also the ideal time to fix any problem spots in grass like bald patches.

Otherwise it's all about enjoying a smooth and verdant swathe of that great Australian institution, the suburban lawn.

MOW HIGH OR LOW?

Old-school thinking is that you cut grass low to keep it down. This is actually a bad thing to do to the lawn, especially in the warmer months.

Cutting too low results in scalping and bare, scorched patches. It also puts a lot of stress on your lawn as it tries to repair the damage and regrow in often hot, dry conditions.

The correct height to mow varies with location and grass type, so it may take a bit of local knowledge and some trial and error to get it right.

As a starting point, set the blade height to at least 40mm and aim to leave enough leaf blade to protect the lawn roots and thatch.

After mowing, get down and look at the lawn leaf blades. They should be a good few centimetres long.

A longer lawn resists drying out, grows more slowly and has fewer weeds. Not only that, it looks fuller and feels heavenly on bare feet. >

MAKE CLEAN CUTS

Cutting the lawn cleanly is important as dirty or dull mower blades damage grass. It then takes longer to recover and can go brown at the tips.

To check your blades, mow a small patch then pick some grass and look at the cut edges. If they're split or ragged the blades need a wash or change.

Many mowers have a port to let you attach the hose and wash the blades while the mower is running.

If yours doesn't, turn the mower on its side with the air filter facing up, blasting the blades with a strong jet of water from the hose.

Inspect the blades and if they aren't smooth and sharp along the cutting edge it's time to replace them.

Take the machine to a mower shop for a service and blade change, or buy replacement parts and do it DIY.

TIP Always disconnect the spark plug before you clean or service a mower.



Mulch or catch?

CLEAN CUTS

Many mowers give you the choice of mulching as you mow or catching lawn clippings. In mulch mode the clippings are finely chopped then blown back at high speed to push them into the thatch.

Mulching as you mow should be done whenever possible as it covers the lawn with micro-mulch that breaks down quickly to provide nutrients and organic matter.

Plus it also helps grass runners stay insulated from temperature



FEED THE GRASS

The two main times for feeding the lawn are early spring and late autumn, but it's still a good idea to have a green-up in the warmer months.

GET GOOD

COVERAGE

When the clan is coming over to visit, the last thing you want is a tired looking lawn. For a quick fix, apply a premixed hose-on lawn food or soil treatment.

Hose-on lawn foods are very fast acting and easy to use. They generally contain a high amount of soluble nitrogen and it's this that contributes to green foliage and makes your lawn look lush fast. When nitrogen is applied in liquid form some of it is absorbed directly through the foliage, greening up the lawn overnight. The remainder of the nutrients make their way to the soil where they are absorbed more slowly.

Hose-on soil treatments like Seasol or UltraBoost+6 work from the ground up by stimulating biological activity and nutrient release in the soil.

As they don't actually contain nutrients they won't produce the near-instant greening effect of a liquid fertiliser, but after about seven days the lawn will show an improvement.

If you want to get maximum bang for your buck from a hose-on lawn food, apply a hose-on soil treatment immediately afterwards as it will amplify and prolong the effect of the fertiliser.

Watering wisely

A well-watered lawn is also a low-maintenance lawn. But this doesn't mean waving the hose around on warm afternoons.

- TIMING is key with the best time to water being in the cool of early morning. Watering in the evening increases the risk of fungal diseases and moisture loss due to evaporation from warm soil.
- INTENSITY is important, so water less often but deeply. Let water sink right down into the soil, encouraging deep roots and making the turf more able to withstand hot, dry conditions. TIP Make sure you're aware of any local water restrictions.





FIX BALD PATCHES

Bare patches in the lawn are very common. They can be a legacy of winter or a sign of underlying soil problems. Bald spots are easy to fix once you know the cause.

A light prune and patch works if the problem has been caused by overshadowing in winter, but if it's wear and tear in a high-traffic area you'll need to lay new turf.

FOR A LARGE AREA or when you want to keep your lawn as a single grass variety, use turf. A roll covers about 1sqm, just cut it to shape and lay.

You'll also need a bag of lawn underlay or top-dressing mix with a high sand content.

FOR SMALL REPAIRS patching with a seed mix is an effective way to fix the problem if you're not concerned about matching grass types.

Scotts Patch Magic has seeds, starter fertiliser and expanding mulch to ensure seed is kept moist as it germinates. Just sprinkle and add water.

PREPARE THE AREA

by using a sharp-bladed spade to cut neat, straight square-edged lines around it. Dig out all existing grass and weeds then trim the edges to a neat shape.



2 AERATE THE SOIL by

pushing a garden fork into it at regular intervals. Remove any excess soil with a spade, using a landscape rake to bring it to level.



3 CHECK THE HEIGHT of

the new turf roll thatch against the depth of the excavated area. There should be a difference of about 20 to 30mm to allow for new soil.



4 LEVEL THE SOIL then use a garden fork to lightly

fluff it up. Spread a lawn top-dressing mix and go over it with a rake. Add the new soil a little at a time, levelling as you go.

Aerating the soil



A lawn can develop bare spots due to soil compaction. Clay soil can become very solidly packed down in areas of only moderate foot traffic, but even good quality soil can become too compacted for roots to penetrate if it has a lot of wear. The solution is to aerate the soil. IN SMALL SPACES simply push a garden fork into the soil to a depth of about 50mm and gently rock it back and forth. Repeat this about every 100mm. IN LARGE YARDS rent a spiked lawn roller. Looking somewhat like a medieval torture device, these rollers make aerating big areas a breeze. Just fill with water and drag or push it around the lawn.


After any aeration the best technique to ensure a long-lasting effect is to rake dry washed river sand or coarse sand into the holes you have opened up. This keeps the aeration and drainage channels open. TIP With heavy clay soil you may also want to add some gypsum or clay breaker.



LAY THE TURF over the area, rolling it out and trimming to fit with a spade. Fill the joints with top-dressing mix to help the new turf knit with the existing grass.



• WATER THE TURF in well then apply a hose-on soil treatment. Water the new turf regularly and avoid walking on it for a few weeks or until it is well established.

INSTALL DRIP IRRIGATION

Sustain your plants with a watering system that makes every drop count

eeping your plants consistently watered throughout summer is essential for a healthy and disease-free garden.

Targeted watering of plants directly at their roots is the most efficient way of ensuring they stay hydrated, and minimises water wastage. Drip irrigation is a proven method of providing a consistent amount of water at ground level where plants need it most, and it's also easy to install.

To start, sketch out the area you want watered and figure out where the main irrigation tube should go, bearing in mind the position of the tap. Next decide how much tubing is needed and what type of drippers you want.



When you have a rough outline, you can start to put together a list of the pieces you need.

After installation, check the system by turning it on slowly and gently until the tubes are filled with water and there is a consistent flow from all drippers.

TIP If the pressure is too high, some drippers may pop out of their tubes.

Designing a system

Irrigation systems are built using a series of individual components, so you can create one according to the needs of your garden. Use the various parts, including tubes, plugs, connectors and clamps, to customise your own hydration structure.








Position the tubing Lay the main irrigation tube over the surface of the garden bed, rolling it out to the full length of the area to be watered. Weigh down each end of the tube with a rock or brick to keep it in position. Cut the tube



2 Insert the end plug
End plugs are barbed and can
sometimes be a little stiff to insert
into the tube by hand. To protect
your fingers, soak the end of the tube
in a cup of boiling water to soften it
first, or use a hammer to nudge the
end plug firmly into place.




Attach the clamp
Clip a ratchet clamp onto the end plug to lock it to the irrigation tube and prevent it from sliding off under the force of the water pressure. Tighten the ratchet clamp manually, then use pliers to squeeze it tighter.



Pierce the tube
Work out where the drip tubes are to be located along the main irrigation tube. Using either a piercing tool or a small screwdriver, make holes in the tube to fit the joiners.

TIP Take care not to cut through




The joiners act as the links between the drip tubes and the main tube. Insert one end into the main tube and attach the other to the drip tube. Joiners can be spiky to grip, so hold them in position using pliers.



Gut the drip tube
Use secateurs to cut each drip tube to length, so that they will reach to the centre of the plants to be watered. Attach a spike end and dripper to each drip tube and drive them into the ground. Test the system by slowly turning on the tap.



Hidden hydration

For the main irrigation tube of this system to reach the tap, three elbow joiners were used to direct the tube so it could be buried under the grass and back up again to connect to the water source.

Adding a timer

Timers are great tools for irrigation systems as they basically do the watering for you. There are two types of timer to choose from.

MECHANICAL TIMERS prevent water wastage by stopping the flow after a set time. It is easy to forget the irrigation system has been switched on, but a mechanical timer will tick down until it's set to turn off, so you don't have to worry about wasting water.

AUTOMATED TIMERS can be programmed to go on between set times on selected days. This takes all the guesswork out of watering the garden and when you go on holiday, you can rest assured that your garden is being looked after and won't dry out.

Keep nuisance insects and snakes out of the house and under control so you can enjoy the warm weather in peace

he biggest downside to the Australian summer is the hordes of bugs, spiders and snakes that come out of their winter hiding places just in time for the festive season.

Like embarrassing relatives you prefer to avoid, these pests tend to drop in unexpectedly for barbecues, backyard parties and even in the middle of the night.

Deterring pests from entering your home and preventing them from taking hold is the best way to keep them under control.

When it comes to spiders and snakes, knowing which pests are dangerous and which are harmless is key to keeping your family safe.



Planting marigolds is a natural way to deter mosquitoes.



Protecting your property

Pest-proofing your home will help the family stay safe all summer. Try some of these quick and easy methods to keep intruders firmly out.

FIX leaking taps that provide moisture sources for insects.

STORE food in sealed containers to limit attractant odours.

TIDY wardrobes and storage rooms, and clear subfloor areas of debris.

SEAL gaps in wall cavities, subfloor areas and under external doors.

REPAIR or install flyscreens on all windows and doors.
TRIM tree branches to remove access to the roof cavity.
CLEAR the yard of rotting vegetation that cockroaches feed on.
REMOVE stagnant water that mosquitoes use for breeding.

THE USUAL SUSPECTS

Flies, cockroaches and mosquitoes are all too familiar summer arrivals. These pests can spread disease or cause nasty bites, so taking action to reduce their numbers in your home is the first step to a comfortable and pest-free summer.



Flies survive by feasting on animal faeces and garbage, picking up germs before landing on your skin or food, potentially spreading disease.

Flies breed in environments full of bacteria, reproducing quickly when the weather turns warm.

PHYSICAL CONTROL Put kitchen scraps in a plastic bag and use a bin with a fitted lid. If using scraps for compost, add sawdust or shredded newspaper to absorb moisture and odours so flies are not attracted.

NATURAL CONTROL Reduce fly numbers by using barriers such as flyscreens or sticky flypaper traps, or control them with swatters or carnivorous plants. Flytraps use baits with pheromones to attract and kill the insects.

CHEMICAL CONTROL Use low toxicity surface or contact sprays to repel and kill flies. Personal insect repellents applied directly to the skin stop flies from landing and spreading harmful germs.



These bugs carry disease and can trigger asthmatic reactions in sufferers when particles of discarded skin become airborne.

Cockroaches are most active at night, hiding in wall cavities, subfloors or roofing during the day.

PHYSICAL CONTROL Cockroaches need water to survive so check dripping taps and wipe kitchen and bathroom sinks dry. Limit food sources by disposing of scraps and keeping food in sealed containers.

NATURAL CONTROL Buy sticky traps and place them in areas of high activity. To make a trap, grease the rim and inside of a round plastic container with butter. Cockroaches will be attracted to the butter, fall inside and get stuck.

CHEMICAL CONTROL Insecticide sprayed at entry points and around drains keeps them out. Baits provide poison food that cockroaches spread to the nest. Use low-toxicity Permethrin dust on breeding sites.



Female mosquitoes deposit saliva containing an anticoagulant when they suck blood to feed their eggs.

Skin reacts because immune systems produce histamine to combat the substance. Apply an ice pack to bites for relief.

PHYSICAL CONTROL Mosquitoes breed in still water so empty saucers under potted plants and fill with damp sand, rake up wet leaves and install a pump in ponds to keep water moving.


NATURAL CONTROL Reduce numbers by planting citrosa geranium, marigold, catnip and rosemary in the garden close to the house and outdoor entertaining areas, as these plants emit odours that mosquitoes don't like.

chemical control insect repellents containing DEET are the most effective solution. They mask the smell of human sweat, the scent that alerts mosquitoes to the presence of a meal.

SPIDER IDENTIFICATION CHART

To treat a spider bite, wash it with soap and water then apply an antibiotic cream and ice. Elevate the affected area and seek emergency treatment straight away, giving a description of the spider if possible so doctors know which antivenom to use.



SNAKE IDENTIFICATION CHART

To treat a snake bite, apply a compression bandage but not so tightly it cuts off blood supply. Use a splint to immobilise the limb and keep still because activity quickly spreads venom. Seek medical assistance and give a description of the snake.

Bushfires are a fact of life in Australia and with urban areas continuing to expand, more people are now living in, or close to, bushfire-prone areas.

This year saw an early start to the bushfire season, following one of the warmest and driest winters on record.

That means the threat of bushfires for the summer ahead is already greater than ever.

PLANNING AHEAD

Having an up-to-date survival plan ensures you and your family know what to do in the event of a bushfire. Review your plan with your family every year and be ready to act when necessary.

On hot, dry or windy days, stay informed by paying attention to local TV and radio broadcasts so you know

if your area is at risk. If a fire breaks out in your area, enact your bushfire survival plan immediately.

Deciding whether to leave early or stay and defend the home depends on how prepared your home is and whether you are physically and emotionally ready to defend it.

If in doubt, leave early and head to the nearest safe place.


Understanding Fire Danger Ratings

Following the Victorian bushfires of 2009, a new Fire Danger Rating system has been developed to include a 'Catastrophic' or 'Code Red' rating.

On these days, fires are likely to be uncontrollable, unpredictable and very fast moving.

If there is a fire in your area on a day rated as Catastrophic or Code Red, staying to defend is unsafe and leaving early is the best option for survival.

Visit the fire service website for your state to make sure you fully understand the Fire Danger Rating system.



PREPARE FOR BUSHFIRE SEASON

If you live anywhere near bushland, there are several steps you can take to prepare your home and your family for a bushfire threat. Keep maintenance up to date and ensure fire fighting equipment is in working order at all times.

UPGRADING THE HOME

Make your home less vulnerable to bushfires and easier to defend if one breaks out near you.



INSTALL metal gutter guards, rooftop sprinklers, a water tank and a long hose that can reach the whole house.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Keep your yard tidy and your home in good condition to reduce the chance of embers causing a fire.



REPLACE broken roof tiles, repair gaps in walls and enclose underfloor areas to stop embers from penetrating.

PREPARE YOURSELF

On high-danger days, the whole family should wear protective clothing and have an emergency survival kit ready.



WEAR work boots, cotton socks, denim jeans and a long-sleeved cotton or wool shirt.



SWAP flyscreens, doormats and timber fences for equivalent, non-combustible metal items.



CLEAN leaf litter from gutters and keep mulch, firewood, rubbish and fuel away from the house.



PREPARE a survival kit containing a first aid kit, radio, torch and bottled water before bushfire season starts.



ATTACH a Static Water Supply (SWS) sign to your front fence if you have a pool, dam or water tank.



MOW lawns regularly, cut back overgrown tree branches and plant shrubs with a low oil content.



PUT on a wide-brimmed hat, protective glasses, leather gloves and a cotton face mask if a fire is near.





Add a water feature

Bring the sight and sound of water into the garden to add tranquillity during the sunny days and hot nights of summer.

For an instant and budget option, float hibiscus flowers in shallow decorative pots filled with water and position on plant stands out of direct sunlight on the deck or patio.

Install a pump in a still pond and attach the tubing to a fountainhead to create a cascade. Or simply buy an all-in-one plinth and pedestal style water feature.

Add aquatic plants to help keep the water algae-free.
TIP Top up the pond regularly to maintain an even water temperature for the plants.



Top pick

For vivid colour that can stand the heat, the Salvia 'Heatwave' Collection from PMA features pink, crimson, white and apricot blooms with names like Blaze and Sizzle (pma.com.au).

Featuring evergreen foliage, a long flowering season and compact rounded habit they can tolerate dry conditions. Grow them in full sun to part shade in free-draining soil. They suit coastal areas and poolside plantings. Use them in pots or in beds where they'll reach 700mm high and a metre wide. Prune after first flowering for more blooms and a denser habit.



Holiday care

Summer is when most of us go on holidays but it's also when plants and lawns need regular watering to survive. Here's how to prepare the garden and keep it maintained while you're away.

■ INSTALL an automatic drip irrigation system with a timer. Set the system to water the garden in the early morning to reduce evaporation and help prevent fungal diseases.

- **MOW** the lawn and arrange to have it cut every few weeks.
- **GROUP** outdoor pots together in a shaded, sheltered position.
- PUT small outdoor containers in larger pots filled with moist sand.
- HAVE a friend come by regularly to water indoor plants, outdoor pots and hanging baskets.
- WEED the garden thoroughly before you go and mulch beds and pots to suppress weeds. ➤





Seasonal jobs

The garden is at its peak in summer, here's how to keep it looking good.

- GIVE houseplants a holiday outside to enjoy fresh air and gentle rain but protect them from wind and sun.
- BUY a potted Wollemi pine as a Christmas tree, keeping it in light shade outdoors during the year.
- RAISE the height of mower blades and cut the grass more often.
- APPLY liquid fertiliser regularly, using products formulated for the species to keep plants healthy.
- SPRAY plants as soon as pests are seen, and pick up any fallen tomatoes to help control fruit fly. TIP Don't apply weedkillers or fertilisers during hot, dry spells.

Fruit picking

Summer is stone-fruit season with lots of varieties ready for picking after spring flowering. Fruit is ripe when it feels firm and has a sweet smell.

APRICOTS are small, golf-ball sized fruits. Harvest when red-gold in colour and just starting to soften, leaving any apricots with a green tinge to ripen on the tree.

PEACHES have a downy skin and bruise easily, so look for unblemished fruit and handle gently. Store them in a plastic bag in the fridge. **NECTARINES** are closely related to

peaches but have a smooth surface. Pick when firm with no green skin. TIP Ripe fruit has juicy flesh, not hard or chewy. Squishy fruit is overripe.



Take tip cuttings

Now is the time to take soft tip cuttings of perennials like verbena, salvia and pelargonium to propagate them ready for planting out in beds and pots in late spring next year.

Select non-flowering shoots, dip the bases in hormone powder and pot up. Leave the cuttings to root for eight weeks then repot in small containers to stop the mix getting waterlogged, which can cause root rot.


Overwinter the pots indoors on a windowsill or in a mini greenhouse.

ost of us stay on top of the watering when the mercury soars, and pull up weeds regularly so we can enjoy the sights and scents of the summer garden.

Another must-do activity is mowing the lawn, but the warm months aren't just about basic maintenance. They are also when lots of tasty vegies are in season.

Now is the time to sow seeds or get seedlings in the ground for a summer crop of salad staples such as beans, cucumbers and tomatoes, plus an autumn harvest of favourites to roast like pumpkin and zucchini.

TIP Seed-filled produce are technically fruits, but for gardening and cooking purposes they are treated like vegies.

THE VEGIE BASICS

Before you start planting, prepare garden beds to give vegetables all the nutrients they need to thrive.

Choose a sunny location with well-drained soil, dig in compost or manure and add lime to very acidic soil, as edibles like a pH of 6.5.

In containers, use a potting mix that's formulated for vegetables.

Sow seeds or transplant seedlings according to the instructions on the packet or label and water in well.

Water in the morning from ground level to prevent mildew and fungal issues and reduce evaporation.

Apply a thin layer of mulch once plants are established. Use an organic type, like lucerne hay, keeping it 100mm from the stems. Feed plants with a complete fruit and vegetable fertiliser during the growing period.

Regularly check for diseases and pests, treating problems immediately.

For a low-maintenance patch, grow disease-resistant varieties and install a drip-irrigation system to take the effort out of watering.

Growing in your zone

Here is a guide to sowing vegetables in December and January across Australia. Successful growing depends on microclimates and available water, so check with your local nursery about what works best in your area.

TROPICAL

Sow beans, broccoli, capsicum, cauliflower, celery, cucumber, eggplant, lettuce, pumpkin, melons, silverbeet, snake beans, spring onion, squash, sweetcorn and tomatoes.

SUBTROPICAL


Sow beans, broccoli, capsicum, cauliflower, cucumber, eggplant, melons, radish, silverbeet, squash, sweetcorn and zucchini.

TEMPERATE

Sow beans, beetroot, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrot, cauliflower, capsicum, celery, cucumber, lettuce, parsnip, potato, radish, silverbeet, squash, sweetcorn and turnip.

COOL

Sow beans, beetroot, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrot, cauliflower, leeks, lettuce, radish, spring onions and turnip.





Climbing runner beans are fast growers, providing lots of fresh food for little work. They also add colour to the vegie patch when in full flower and laden with pods.

Runner beans are described as perennial because they grow and produce all summer and autumn, then die down in winter when they go dormant, emerging again in spring.

They feature large seeds in long green pods and typically have red flowers although certain types bear white, pink or multicoloured blooms.

Ideal for small gardens, runner beans take up little room if grown on a tripod, teepee or wigwam. **SOW SEEDS** 50mm deep in moist soil from spring to midsummer or plant seedlings every 150mm in double rows spaced about 600mm apart.

Guide the stems up a support and secure using soft ties, and the bean plants will climb naturally.

WATER PLANTS regularly in hot, dry weather then increase watering when in flower and the pods begin to swell, making sure the soil never dries out. HARVEST FRUIT from eight weeks when the pods are 170mm or less, picking beans two times a week. LOOK FOR slugs and snails, removing them from the leaves of young plants by hand. Also check for signs of fungal diseases like bean rust.

Apply a fungicide if leaves drop, wither or yellow, and brown or red spots appear on foliage, pods or stems. **TIP** Runner beans produce edible flowers but picking them prevents pods forming, so you need to choose between blooms and vegies.

Mediterranean green beans

Top and tail 450g of green beans and boil in a saucepan for three minutes or until just cooked but still firm.

Refresh under cold running water, drain and pat dry.

Heat one tablespoon of olive oil in a frying pan and stir-fry one thinly sliced onion over a medium heat for about eight minutes or until softened.

Stir 16 whole red cherry tomatoes and two teaspoons of olive oil into the onions. Cook for two minutes, turning the tomatoes gently once or twice.

Add the cooked green beans to the pan and stir over the heat for one minute to warm through. Add 30g flaked toasted almonds before serving. COOK'S TIPS

- Serve these beans with beef or chicken as a side dish.
- To make the dish a main meal, add 200g diced cooked potatoes to the pan with the onions.






Tracking snails

One of the biggest threats to the vegie patch, snails eat crops under cover of darkness, leaving a slimy trail behind to show just where they've been.

But a new study in the UK by the University of

Exeter has revealed the secret lives of snails.

They can cover 25m in 24 hours and travel in convoys, piggy-backing on the slime of other snails to save their energy for ravaging your vegies.

A sprawling vine or bush plant, cucumbers are fast croppers that can fruit well into autumn and the more you pick them, the more they grow.

Cucumbers can bear the usual long green fruit and also pale green or white round varieties called apple cucumbers. Apple cucumbers are not ideal where mildew is a problem.

Gherkins are immature green cucumbers, picked young and pickled. Any green variety can be used but the traditional type has short spiny fruit.

Keep cucumbers in the fridge crisper and use quickly in salads and sandwiches to enjoy them while fresh.

For pickles and relishes, try firm varieties like County Fair and Picklebush. Regal is a high yielding and disease resistant variety while Lebanese cucumbers are great all-rounders that fruit prolifically.

SOW SEEDS in fertile, well-drained soil in full sun. Space vine types about a metre apart and let them trail on the ground or train them up a trellis.

Bush varieties need to be spaced 400mm apart and are ideal for pots. **WATER PLANTS** regularly, making sure to never let the soil dry out. **HARVEST FRUIT** from eight weeks at 200mm long. Pick apple types when the size of a cricket ball.

LOOK FOR mottled yellow leaves

and stunted growth caused by cucumber mosaic virus. There is no treatment or cure, affected plants must be removed and destroyed.

Pickled cucumber

Prepare the vinegar two months in advance by combining 7g each of cinnamon sticks, whole cloves, whole nutmeg, allspice and white peppercorns in a muslin bag.

Pour one litre of vinegar into a bottle and add the spice bag. Leave it to steep for two months, shaking the bottle occasionally.

Wash three cucumbers, wipe dry and cut in half lengthways then chop into 10mm thick slices. Layer with coarse salt in a deep dish and leave for 24 hours.

Drain the liquid and rinse cucumbers in cold water. Drain again and pack into sterilised jars then cover with hot, spiced vinegar and seal. They will be ready to eat in a week.

Pumpkins

Eaten mostly as a winter food, pumpkins should be planted now. Seeds need to be sown into warm soil in order to germinate and December or January is the ideal time to get started for an autumn harvest.

With a sprawling habit, pumpkins can take up a lot of space, so in small gardens train the vines up the side of a shed then use a ladder to harvest them from the roof. Or choose bush varieties like Golden Nugget that can be grown in large containers.

SOW SEEDS in saucer-shaped troughs on mounded soil. Space the mounds one to two metres apart, sow five seeds into each and cover with mulch.

The mounds keep roots cool and improve drainage while the troughs direct water to the roots.

WATER PLANTS regularly to stop the fruit splitting, and to protect their shallow roots in dry or windy weather.


HARVEST FRUIT from 14 to 20 weeks, depending on the variety. Leave as much stem as possible attached to help pumpkins last longer.

LOOK FOR powdery mildew, a disease common to vines, that spreads a white film on leaves. Treat with a fungicide. **TIP** Damp soil can cause pumpkins to rot so put young fruit on boards raised off the ground to protect them.

Save space and grow pumpkins up a trellis but give them help to climb when young

Squash & zucchini

Summer squash is the name given to a range of vegies of different shapes and sizes, from light to dark green and bright yellow in colour.

This includes dark-green zucchinis and round or oval fruit in a lighter green. Squash usually refers to the button varieties in green and yellow.

Zucchini and squash can spread over a wide area and are good, fast croppers so you only need a few of each plant to feed the average family. **SOW SEEDS** in well-drained, fertile soil improved with well-rotted compost. Mound up the soil and sow two or three seeds at 25mm deep, spaced about 700mm apart. **WATER PLANTS** regularly and increase

the fruits are growing and ripening.

Don't let the soil dry out but don't overwater either as this can promote leaf growth at the expense of fruit.

HARVEST FRUIT often when the plants are at their peak in summer.

Cut off zucchini with a sharp knife

watering when flowering starts and

plants are at their peak in summer. Cut off zucchini with a sharp knife when about 150mm long. Pick squash when young. Regular picking encourages the plants to keep fruiting.

Don't leave even one zucchini to turn into a marrow when harvesting or fruit production will slow down.

LOOK FOR snails and slugs which can strip seedlings overnight and lay baits or scatter pellets. Powdery mildew can be a problem, so cut off leaves showing a white film and treat the plant with an organic spray.

TIP If growth is slow, give the plants a liquid feed once a month.

Pollinating vegie flowers


Cucumber, zucchini, pumpkin and squash have male or female flowers. The females need to be pollinated to produce fruit. In sunny weather bees do the job but in cool or wet conditions, hand pollination can ensure a good crop. The female flower has tiny fruit behind it.

■ TEST THE MALE with a fingertip when the flowers are fully open. If pollen grains stick it's ready.

■ PICK THE FLOWER and gently strip the petals, then

press into the centre of a female flower or use a dry paintbrush to transfer the pollen. Use one male on four females and repeat three days in a row.


TIP For large fruits allow only one flower to develop on each stem.



EATING THE BLOOMS

The yellow trumpet-shaped flowers of either sex are edible but the males are mostly used in cooking as they can be picked without stopping fruit production.

- PICK THE FLOWERS and cut off the stems then rinse and gently pat dry between paper towels. If they are not to be eaten straight away, put them in a plastic bag and store in the fridge crisper for a few days.
- DIP IN BATTER and deep-fry in oil, add raw to salads or stuff with a rice, cheese and herb mixture then bake. TIP Only eat flowers you know have been grown organically without the use of pesticides. ➤

Tomatoes


A sweet, juicy fruit you can pick and eat fresh from the vine, tomatoes are easy to grow in the garden or pots.

Make sure they have support, as they can reach from 900mm to over three metres. Tie the stems to stakes or use a tomato cage.

Feed tomatoes with potash, not a complete fertiliser, to make them flower earlier and produce more fruit. **SOW SEEDS** in early summer to 5mm deep or transplant seedlings, burying the stem up to the first set of leaves. WATER PLANTS little and often, so the soil doesn't dry out. If the plants are lush but not setting fruit, water less. **HARVEST FRUIT** when ripe, cutting the stalk but leaving the calyx. LOOK FOR tomato caterpillars that feed on new growth and eat fruit from the stem. Spray with pyrethrum.




Add one finely chopped large onion, a chopped garlic clove, the tomatoes, 150ml vegetable stock and two tablespoons of chopped basil. Cook over medium heat for 30 minutes or until the sauce is thick.

Cool slightly and puree until smooth then pass the sauce through a fine sieve. Add a pinch of sugar and freshly ground black pepper to taste.

Double cropper

A hand-grafted plant that grows tomatoes and potatoes is being sold by UK company Thompson & Morgan. This double cropper is called The TomTato and is sure to be a big hit, though it's not yet available in Australia. ≽



Capsicum

Also known as peppers, capsicums are large bell-like fruits. They grow on small bushes with dark-green leaves and white, cream or purple flowers.

They are green before they ripen then turn red, yellow or purple as they mature. Picking green fruit produces a bigger crop but ripe capsicums have a sweeter taste. **SOW SEEDS** or transplant seedlings in early summer. Capsicums need heat and humidity, so give them a sunny sheltered position in beds or pots. **HARVEST FRUIT** when full sized using secateurs to cut the fruit with 25mm of stalk attached. Don't pull them off the stem, as this can cause damage and provide an entry point for disease. WATER PLANTS regularly as changing moisture levels can cause blossom end rot, which looks like a brown, dead patch at the base of the fruit. LOOK FOR aphids and spray with eco oil, and set out baits for fruit flies. >

Holiday care for vegies

If you are planning to go away for more than a week the best thing to do is arrange for crops to be harvested and watered while you're gone.

Peas, beans, capsicums and tomatoes need to be picked as they mature. Root vegetables in particular need regular watering but all plants require water to develop new fruit.

If you can't get outside help, here are ways to prepare the vegie patch.

- SPREAD ORGANIC MULCH around widely spaced plants like cabbages to retain moisture and suppress weeds.
- REMOVE FLOWERS from plants that may set seed or develop fruit.
- PICK CUCUMBERS no matter how small and new fruits will develop and be ready to pick when you return.
- GIVE PLANTS a good soaking to encourage the new fruits and set up soaker hoses on an automatic timer.

Vegetables have to be picked when ripe otherwise they will drop or rot, and once harvested they have to be used raw or cooked within days.

If you had a bumper crop this year don't give it all away. Here's how to store the surplus so all that food doesn't go to waste.

The three most common ways to preserve food are drying, freezing and pickling, making fruits and vegetables available out of season.

Only preserve produce that is firm, ripe, well coloured and free of blemishes. Most produce needs to be cut or trimmed first.

Blanching vegetables helps them keep their vitamins and colour. It's especially important before drying to destroy potentially harmful bacteria.



QUICK PICKLING

A popular method of preserving vegies is to pickle them in spiced vinegar.

It's a big flavour booster and prolongs shelf life by several weeks. You can preserve whole or cut vegies and combine different types in one jar.

Varying the amount of vinegar, sugar, salt and spices in the mixture takes the method beyond pickling and into the territory of producing relishes and chutneys.

Use sterilised glass jars and utensils for storing preserved produce. Wash them in hot, soapy water then boil in a pan for 15 minutes and heat in the oven for 10 minutes or until dry.



BACKYARD DRYING

Using the sun to dry produce is the oldest and simplest way to preserve.

Vegies suitable for drying include green beans, tomatoes, mushrooms, capsicum and chillies.

Spread the vegies in a single layer on a drying tray and leave in a warm spot elevated 150mm off the ground to allow air to circulate. Cover the tray with weighted cheesecloth to protect it from insects, adding canvas overnight.

Sundried vegies are preserved in oil with herbs and spices in sterilised jars. **TIP** Grind dried vegies into powder, store in an airtight container and use in soups, stews or casseroles.



EASY FREEZING

Freezing is a simple and reliable way to store food, retaining its flavour, colour, texture and nutritional value better than food preserved any other way.

Freezing maintains the appearance of the food, so pick young vegies at peak flavour and freeze immediately. Vegies that are usually cooked before serving are suitable for freezing.


Blanch them in boiling water then pack meal-sized portions in strong freezer wrap or bags, expelling as much air as possible. Label then freeze.

Cook frozen vegies for a shorter time than usual, as they're partially cooked from the blanching process.



To prepare vegies for preserving, immerse in boiling water then cool under running water.



Sundried tomatoes



Wash and dry tomatoes then cut in half lengthways, leaving the seeds in. Position cut-side up on a drying tray, sprinkle with salt and cover with cheesecloth.

Drying trays have timber frames and non-metallic mesh or slats. Put the tray outside until the tomatoes are completely dry. Leave the tray in full sun then ventilated shade for six days each, ensuring the tray is kept dry.

The oven can also be used to dry tomatoes on the lowest setting, just make sure they don't start to cook. It takes about 12 hours.

SUMMER GARDEN PESTS AND DISEASES



RUSSET MITE

SPOT IT Too tiny to see, these mites turn leaves of tomato, chilli and capsicum yellow then brown and papery. Stems turn brown and lose their hairs, and it also affects the fruit. ZAP IT Spray with wettable sulphur or tomato dust. Don't plant tomatoes in the same spot next year.

SPOTTED WILT

SPOT IT Spread by thrips, this virus affects tomato, lettuce, potato and capsicum. Dead patches appear on

the leaves, often in concentric circles. Crops are stunted. **ZAP IT** Remove and destroy infected plants. Control weeds and spray with maldison or pyrethrum to control thrips.

CATERPILLAR

SPOT IT Chewed plants are the first sign, young caterpillars feed on new growth and the mature

ones eat fruit from the stem. ZAP IT Pick off and squash individuals. For infestations, use Dipel bacteria or a pyrethrum-based plant spray.

26-SPOTTED LADYBIRD

SPOT IT Green-yellow 6mm long larvae covered with black spines cause skeletonised round patches

in leaves. Adult ladybirds have 26 or 28 spots. ZAP IT Pick off and squash. If you have a severe infestation and no beneficial ladybirds, use a

general insecticide.

METALLIC FLEA BEETLES

SPOT IT Shiny 3mm beetles cause small, irregular holes in young leaves and buds. Often on lettuce, hibiscus, rhubarb and grape. ZAP IT For an organic treatment, use sticky traps and dispose of by hand. Or treat with a diluted detergent

or pyrethrum-based

insect spray.

DOWNY MILDEW

SPOT IT Pale green spots appear on the upper side of leaves with

furry growth beneath. ZAP IT Increase space between plants to reduce humidity. Spray with 100ml of milk in 900ml of water, adding a pinch of bicarbonate of soda to the mix, or use a commercial oil on a cloudy day.

FRUIT FLY

SPOT IT Ripe fruit is rotted from its maggot-chewed centre. Flies are attracted to yellow surfaces.

ZAP IT Seal infected fruit in

a plastic bag, cook in the sun then throw in the bin. Apply fenthion-based spray regularly or use a fruit fly bait.

BACTERIAL BLIGHT

SPOT IT Common on peas, leaves develop spots that turn brown or black and shrivel. Green spots on pods turn dark brown.

ZAP IT It's introduced from

infected seeds so buy new each year. Rotate crops next season. Spray with a copper-based product and water in the morning only.

APHIDS

SPOT IT These small green sap suckers prefer warm environments and live mainly on the softest plant parts, such as the stems and underside of leaves.

ZAP IT Combine 100ml of vegie oil with a litre of water and a teaspoon of grated natural soap, mix and treat weekly, or use a rose spray.

SCALE

SPOT IT Tiny white lumps cling onto stems or the underside of leaves, the honeydew they produce encourages black sooty mould.

ZAP IT Treat as for aphids, or remove small infestations with a toothbrush or scrape off with your fingernail.

Chillies and Squash ensuring a

long and uniform harvest period. These plants cope well with heat, as long as they are planted in well-prepared soil with thick mulch and are watered regularly. Mulching keeps the plant's root system cool and adds nutrients and organic matter to the soil as it breaks down.

Early Summer is a great time to sow many of the classic cottage flowers including Asters, Cosmos,

Foxglove, Hollyhock, Poppies and Zinnias.

They will be ready for planting out early in the new year to provide an array of colour in late Summer through Autumn. If you have kids in

the family, keep them entertained during the holiday season with gardening projects.

These can be both educational and fun, keeping kids busy and learning about their natural environment.

CHRISTMAS COLOUR

Give bright-leafed poinsettias as gifts, use lilies as festive centrepieces or celebrate the season with a native bush

lamboyant and eye-catching, poinsettias are classic Christmas plants. Native to Mexico, they grow wild in tropical forests, yet can withstand some cold.

Poinsettias can be enjoyed as indoor plants all year round but really come into their own during the festive season when they are used as decorations or given as a gift.

In the northern hemisphere, poinsettias are traditionally used as living Christmas decorations because their leaves and bracts suit a red and green colour scheme.

They are used the same way here but the bracts of the plants

have to be forced into putting on a bright red display out of season.

For brilliant bracts by Christmas, keep the plants in the dark for at least 14 hours a day from mid spring. Overnight between 5pm and 8am is the easiest time to do this.

Give them a sunny north-facing position or bright filtered light in temperatures of about 21°C and they will last indoors with little care for weeks or even months.

Water only when the mix is dry to the touch and always empty the saucers so the plants don't sit in water.

After the holidays are over, put poinsettias in a lightly shaded

position to recover. When exposed to summer daylight again the bracts will revert to green leaves.

CHOOSING A COLOUR

Poinsettia cultivars come in lots of colours, not just the red and green. Visit your local nursery around Christmas to choose a plant that suits your holiday decorating scheme, as they will have been forced into colour at that time of year.











BRACTS NOT BLOOMS

Many people think of poinsettias as having large, showy red petals but these are modified leaves called bracts.

They grow around the true flowers, which are insignificant white to yellow blooms massed together in the centre of each leaf cluster.

Euphorbia pulcherrima is the common single red variety. Some cultivars, like 'Henriette Ecke' have double red leaves and hybridisation techniques have led to a wide range of bract colours including white, yellow, orange, pink and even purple.

Poinsettias produce a sticky white sap. When using them as cut flowers stand the stems in very hot water until it cools to thicken the substance.

The plants bought at this time of year as gifts are sold as dwarf varieties but have actually had their growth stunted by hormones so they only grow about 300mm high and wide.

If planted out they reach a natural height of three or four metres.

They only last a year but cuttings from summer and winter pruning can be used to propagate new plants.

Take 300mm stem cuttings, dip the ends in water then insert into potting soil and keep moist for several weeks until the cuttings begin to make roots.

TIP To keep the plant bushy, lightly tip-prune at least once in summer.





Planting poinsettias

In the warmer zones of Australia, including regions of Qld, NSW, SA and WA, poinsettias can be grown outside. In cooler areas, plant in a sheltered position or grow them indoors.

Choose a spot with full sun and well-drained slightly acidic soil improved with organic matter.

Dig a planting hole slightly larger than the rootball, position the plant so

10mm of the rootball is above ground level then backfill. Water in well then at least weekly and feed regularly.

Left alone poinsettias get leggy and straggly. In late winter or spring, cut them back hard after flowering. Take the plant almost to soil level for new shoots in a few weeks.

Prune again in late summer and apply liquid potash during autumn.

GROWING A FESTIVE NATIVE

Certain Australian natives that flower around the end of the year are commonly called Christmas plants and have been used as festive flora since the 1800s. Grow them in pots and keep indoors during the season then plant them outside.



Ceratopetalum gummiferum Christmas bush

- Shrub to 5m high and 1m wide
- White star-like spring blooms
- Red calyxes in summer
- Full sun in well-drained soil



Prostanthera lasianthos Christmas tree

- Shrub or small tree
- Grows from 2m to 10m tall
- White, pink or mauve blooms
- Heavy shade or full sun



Bursaria spinosa Christmas bush

- Hardy shrub from 3m
- Masses of white flowers in late spring and summer
- Light shade in well-drained soil



Nuytsia floribunda Christmas tree

- Grows to 10m tall
- Bright orange summer blooms
- Full sun
- Frost resistant



Calanthe triplicate Christmas orchid

- Evergreen orchid good for pots
- Heavy shade in moist soil
- White flowers on 1.5m long spikes in summer



Blandfordia punicea Christmas bells

- Red 10mm long bell-shaped flowers with yellow tips
- Flower stalks to 1m high
- Full sun in sandy soil >

Featuring white, trumpet-shaped blooms on long stems, the heavily scented *Lilium longiflorum* or Christmas lily is a favourite both indoors as a cut flower and outside in the garden.

They bloom from late spring and throughout summer and are also called November lilies, depending on the climate and when they first flower.

Liliums are true lilies and there are hundreds of hybrids in a huge array of flower forms and colours.

The time to plant bulbs is late autumn to winter but Christmas lilies and other varieties of Asiatic and Oriental liliums are readily available as potted plants at this time of year.

Keep them in their containers or plant out in the garden in well-drained soil in a position with morning sun, watering well during summer. **TIP** Liliums are big feeders so fertilise regularly during the growing season.

Arranging cut flowers

Liliums make wonderful cut flowers and if cared for can last two weeks.

Put the flowers in a bucket of lukewarm water then, working underwater, cut 25 to 50mm off the stems on a 45° angle using a sharp, clean knife.

Add clean water and flower food to a vase, remove any leaves below the water line and arrange the lilies. Position the vase out of direct sun and change the water every few days.

The pollen can stain fabric, skin and furniture, so snip off the anthers on the end of the stamens as the flowers open to prevent them dropping.

Lilies are highly toxic to cats, so make sure they don't bite the leaves or petals, lick pollen off their fur or drink the vase water.

POTS OF COLOUR

Give a rusted plant stand a complete overhaul then add potted blooms for a bright display of summer annuals

andyman Deputy editor
Artemis Gouros picked up
a metal rack at a garage sale,
intending to give it a coat of new
paint and use it as a plant stand.

The stand was on the DIY to-do list for years, getting rustier and rustier.

'I decided to revamp the plant stand in time for this summer and use it to display annuals,' says Artemis.

'It is the perfect size for flowerpots and metal suits the rustic look in my yard. I like using plant stands, as you're less likely to forget to water the flowers when they're all in one spot.

'There was rust on the stand but I found a range of products for metal by White Knight. I treated the rust and applied a metal primer to protect against corrosion before painting.

'I chose Marine Blue but the epoxy enamel used can be tinted to any Colorbond or Taubmans colour.

'With preparation work and drying times in between coats, the makeover took a few days to complete. 'It took a lot of elbow grease and brushstrokes but now the stand looks so good my sister wanted it for her new deck.

'I said no, but that I'd keep an eye out for another one and paint it for her.'

Painting rusted metal

Metal surfaces have to be free of dust, dirt, grease, oil and rust before they are painted, so use a wire brush to remove flaking rust and old paint then scrub with soapy water and leave to dry.



SCRUB THE METAL with steel wool and a wire brush to remove flaking paint or loose rust, then sand with 60 grit abrasive paper.



TREAT THE SURFACE with a rust converter, applying it with a brush and leaving it to dry, then apply a metal primer using a paintbrush.



PAINT THE STAND with two coats of a rust-inhibiting enamel paint, applying it with a brush. TIP You can also use spray paint.



Summer blooms

The best way to inject colour into the garden during summer is with a display of annual flowers.

Annuals are short-lived plants that germinate, mature and die within months, completing their entire life cycle in one growing season.

It's not too late to plan a showcase if you didn't prepare beds in spring, as many annuals can be sown or grown from December to February.

Sow seeds now for flowers in eight to 12 weeks, depending on the variety. Or transplant seedlings and water them in with a seaweed solution to help the plants form strong roots.

If you lack flowerbeds, create a potted display and change it with

the seasons. For instant results, buy potted colour from your local nursery.

TIP To prolong the flowering show, deadhead blooms regularly.


