WOODBLANK

To order the wood blank for this project, send \$7.99 to Cabin Crafters, 1225 W. 1st Street, Nevada, IA 50201. Call (800) 669-3920 or (515) 382-5406.

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline pattern from the pattern packet to 3/8" pine. Cut out using a scroll saw. The 73/16" diameter base is cut from 3/8" pine.

Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Transfer the main pattern outlines from the pattern packet. Transfer details as needed.

PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

Base the bear Mocha Brown; shade with Autumn Brown. Stipple the highlight with Maple Sugar while the basecoat is still wet. Base the mouth area Maple Sugar; shade with Burnt Sienna. Add blush to the cheeks with Rouge. Base the eyes Black and add highlight with Blue Jay to the lower left

corners. Add a highlight dot to the upper right corners with White. The nose and mouth are thinned Black.

Base the hat Black; highlight with Blue Jay. The brim outline is done with thinned Blue Jay.

Base the hatband Blue Danube: shade with Blue Denim. The double line detail is done with thinned Pine Green. Base the buckle Dark Goldenrod; highlight with Calypso Orange.

Base the bow Antique White; shade with Mudstone. The double line detail is done with thinned Pine Green.

Base the shamrocks Pine Green; highlight with Wedgewood Green. The polka dots are done with thinned Blue Jay and the lettering is done with thinned Antique White.

EASY FINISH

Drill holes as shown on the pattern and insert wire and glue to secure.







PAINTING Base the b

liner for fine linework. Use

an old, small, worn-out

flat for dry-brushing,

such as on the cheeks.

Base the bunny Light
Buttermilk. Her eyes, lids,
brows, and smile are Lamp
Black. Highlight each eye with a
tiny dot of Light Buttermilk. Scrub
her cheeks, paint button nose, and
shade inside ears with Gooseberry
Pink. Shade the bunny with Milk
Chocolate. Shade the bottom of her
feet with Gooseberry Pink over the
Milk Chocolate.

Base the flower French Mauve, highlight with Pink Chiffon, and shade with Mauve. Base the flower center Marigold and shade with Light Cinnamon. Base the leaves Hauser Medium Green and shade with Hauser Dark Green.

Base the bee Yellow Ochre with a Lamp Black head and stripes. Base the wings Light Buttermilk and shade with Marigold.

EASY FINISH

Spatter the entire piece lightly with Lamp Black. Attach a sawtooth hanger to the back of the flower. Varnish all wood pieces with several coats of J.W. etc. Right Step

Varnish (satin finish), allowing to dry between coats.

Glue the flower center to the top of the flower and the wood plug nose to the bunny. Using a running stitch, gather the dress with the apron on the top as one piece and glue to the bunny with hot glue. Hot-glue the button on top.

Wrap one piece of sock fabric around each ankle and hot-glue the seam to the back of the bunny. Add bows and buttons to ankles and head.

Make two sets of whiskers from sisal twine, each with about 8 pieces of sisal, about 5" long. Carefully fold the whiskers in half and dip into a little glue. Insert into the holes in face, using the needle top of small stylus to guide into the hole. Wire all pieces together (option: I threaded bunny together with crochet cotton) then use wire to assemble the flower and bee areas. When whisker glue is dry, trim whiskers to desired length.



CUTTING

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood.
Cut the bunny, bee, and flower from 3/4" pine and the flower center from 1/4"
Baltic birch plywood. Cut out using a

scroll saw. Drill holes as indicated on the pattern. Sand with 400-grit sandpaper; wipe clean with a tack cloth. Fill in any holes with J. W. etc. Wood Filler. Allow to dry; sand and tack again. Seal with J. W. etc. White Lightning. Allow to dry; sand with 400-grit sandpaper and

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. Cut the large bunny's body from ³/₄" pine and her head from ¹/₂" pine. Cut the flowers from ¹/₄" plywood and all the pieces for the bunny pin from ¹/₈" plywood. Cut out using a scroll saw. Sand all pieces with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Transfer details as needed.

BASECOAT & SHADING

Base the bunny Buttermilk. Shade behind the head, under the ears, and around the body and toes with Antique White. Base the nose Mauve, shade the bottom with Cranberrry Wine, and highlight with Light Buttermilk. The eyes and mouth are Black. Highlight the eyes with Light Buttermilk dots.

Base the leaves and stems Mint Julep Green; shade and detail with Hauser Dark Green. This shading is meant to be loose. Shade under the flower and here and there on the stems. Float a vein in the center of the leaves. Base the tulip Mauve, shade with Cranberry Wine, and highlight with Light Buttermilk.

Base the flower on the left Boysenberry Pink, shade with Cranberry Wine, and highlight with Light Buttermilk. Use the 10/0 liner to add Cranberry Wine detail lines. Add a bit of *DecoArt* Extender to be able to pull thin lines. The center is Cadmium Yellow.

Base the flower on the right Summer Lilac, shade with Lavender, and highlight


with Light Buttermilk. Add Lavender details and a Cadmium Yellow center.

EASY FINISH

Blush the cheeks with a red chalk pencil. All "stitching" is done with a Rotring Rapidoliner pen No. .25(000). Glue flowers and head to bunny's body. Spray lightly with several coats of Krylon Matte Spray Finish or Crystal Clear to seal in the blush pencil and inking. Glue the pinback to the back of the pin.



PREP STEP

Transfer the outline pattern of the head, hands, and sign to 1/8" Baltic birch plywood. Cut out pieces with a scroll saw. Sand wood pieces and eggs; wipe clean with a tack cloth. Seal, and sand again. Drill holes in sign (see pattern for placement). Wash coffee can with soapy water and rinse with vinegar. Sand coffee can. Make sure to sand inner edge with electric sander; this will take care of any sharp edges where can was opened. Spray can with metal primer.

CAN

Background: Sponge the top 13/4" of the can with Lemonade. Cut 3/4" square from compressed sponge and sponge two rows of Licorice checks over Lemonade. When dry, tape off bottom of painted area. Sponge French Blue, Baby Blue, and Warm White on the rest of the can.

Flowers with Leaves: Transfer 8 flowers with leaves, alternating up and down on can. Using the #8 shader, paint flowers Rose Pink. Using 1/2" stippler, drybrush centers with Warm White mixed with a tiny amount of Rose Pink. Mix equal parts of Rose Pink, Autumn Leaves, and Holiday Red and paint the flower centers, using the #4 filbert. Using the 3/8" angular, paint the leaves Green Meadow. When leaves are dry, apply Bayberry on the #8 shader, wipe off on a paper towel and go over the leaves to highlight. Sponge Lemonade circles, here and there, using the 1/4" dauber.

BUNNY

Nose: Make the bunny's nose (see pattern piece for size) out of *Sculpey* Clay; bake, following manufacturer's instructions. Mix equal parts of Rose Pink, Autumn Leaves, and Holiday Red to paint nose using the ³/₈" angular. Paint the highlight on his nose with Warm White and the liner brush.

Head and Hands: Mix equal amounts of Honeycomb and Mink Coat to paint head, ears, and hands, using the 1/2" wash. Dry-brush outer edges with Nutmeg, using the 1/4" stippler. Transfer the face and inner ear lines. Dry-brush the cheeks and inner ears with Holiday Red and the 1/2" DM stippler. Using the #4 shader, paint the plaid on the inner ears with Warm White mixed with a little water. Paint up and down, then across

then dry-brush over plaid on inner ears.

Sign: Paint the sign French Vanilla, using the ¹/₂" wash. Dry-brush the edges with Nutmeg, using the ¹/₄" stippler. Transfer the words on the sign and go over with the large end of *Zig* pen. Insert piece of wire through holes in sign (leaving a 5" loop to hang sign) and coil the ends.

Eggs: Paint two eggs Lemonade and one French Blue. On one yellow egg, paint stripes using Bayberry and the #4 shader. On the other yellow egg, paint a plaid, using Rose Pink and the #8 shader. On each side of the plaid, paint Bayberry stripes, using the liner brush. On the blue egg, daub circles of Lemonade, using the 1/4" dauber. Drybrush all eggs with Warm White and the 1/2" DM stippler.

Pen Work: With the small end of the Zig pen, go over eyes, mouth, and whiskers. Outline the head, ears, inner ears, hands, flowers, leaves, circles on can, stripes, plaid, and circles on egg. Make dots on can, blue egg, and detail lines. Varnish wood pieces and can (using four coats on can).

FINISHING

With E6000, glue head to back of can (see pattern for placement line). When dry, drill 1/16" hole 2" apart, from back of the head through the can. Starting at the back, insert wire through one hole, across to other hole and through to back. Tightly twist wire together and trim ends (the wire will be covered with sleeves).

Sleeves: Cut fabric 16" x 8" x ¹/₂", Press short ends under ¹/₂". On wrong side, place a roll of fiberfill along the vertical center of each sleeve. Fold long edges over fiberfill, overlap ¹/₂", and hotglue together. Hand gather folded short edge, slip hand in, pull up thread and knot. Hot-glue sleeve to hand. Repeat for other hand. With seam towards can and centering sleeve, hot-glue sleeve to can. Place sign over hand and glue hand to can using E6000 glue.

Collar: Cut into lace edge of doily and cut away all of the center of doily up to 1/4" from lace. Clip into doily almost up to lace, fold under clipped edge and hot-glue around neck, trim off excess doily. Make bow out of ribbon, trim ends, and hot-glue to neck.

Hat: Place hat on head with slit around ears and opening at back. Overlap and hot-glue back of hat to head. Fold brim up and hot-glue to ears. Hot-glue leaves, rose, and small flowers to brim. Place paper shreddies and eggs in can. You could fill with candy or cookies for a delightful Springtime treat!



PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. Cut the bear and flower piece from 3/4" pine and the two leaves from 1/4" Baltic birch plywood.

Drill holes as indicated. Cut the 3/8" wooden dowel to desired length. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; tack clean. Seal the wood with waterbased wood sealer. Transfer the main pattern outlines.

Base the flower Light Buttermilk; apply pattern for petal separations. Paint one petal at a time. Brush on a wet coat of Blue Chiffon. Side load the dirty brush into Salem Blue and stroke it on the petal paying attention to the way it curves. Repeat with each petal; let dry. Shade under the bear; let dry. Separate all the petals with Salem Blue + Lavender.

You will need two good shaders to accomplish the next step. Side load one of the shaders into Salem Blue + a tad of Yellow Green. Apply to a petal one at a time, under the bear. With the other brush on the chisel edge, drag the sideload down the petal, again paying attention to the curve of the petal. Deepen some of the shadows and line each petal with Salem Blue + Payne's Grey.

The wings are next; paint them Petal

Pink. Dry-brush their tips with Light Buttermilk, and next to the bear with Dioxazine Purple. You may need to add more Petal Pink in the middle. Transfer the wings detail pattern. Line the wings with Payne's Grey; let dry. Dry-brush areas with more Light Buttermilk, and side-load the Dioxazine Purple areas with Lavender. Touch up your line work if needed.

Base the bear Honey Brown + a tad of Light Buttermilk. Apply the detail pattern. Shade the fur with Milk Chocolate. Dry-brush highlights and muzzle with Light Buttermilk + a tad of Honey Brown. Dry-brush to highlight the muzzle again with Light Buttermilk and anywhere her fur may need it. Paint the costume Payne's Grey, shade with Black, and dry-brush highlight with Blue Chiffon. The roses on her shoulders are Salem Blue + Dioxazine Purple. Shade the bottom of the roses and the bowl with Dioxazine Purple. Stroke three tiny petals at the bottom of the roses, one above, and one under the bowl with Light Buttermilk + Salem Blue. Add four flick leaves two on each side of both roses with Avocado + Yellow Green. The ribbon streamers are Dioxazine Purple + Light Buttermilk. Add lighter highlights to the streamers to pop them out. Dot the baby's breath with Light Buttermilk then dot again with Petal Pink. Add a coat of DecoArt Faux Glaze Medium to all; let dry.

Line the fur, add the eyes, nose, mouth, and brows with Black. Stroke the eyes and nose with Light Buttermilk. Add another coat of the glaze to the face. Let dry. Dry-brush the






Base the leaves and stick Avocado; shade the leaves down the center doing a reverse float and on the edges with Avocado + Black. Dry-brush the highlights with Yellow Green. Add three coats of Varnish.


Twist the wire on to the stick and glue the leaves in place. Wood-glue the flower to the top of the stick and enjoy.

WOOD BLANK

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. The building is cut from ³/₄" pine, the roof, canopy, and door are cut from ¹/₄" Baltic birch plywood, and the flowerboxes are cut from ¹/₈" Baltic birch plywood. Sand all pieces with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Transfer details as needed.

BRUSHES

Use the larger wash brushes for basecoating and shading. Use the ³/₄" mop to soften the shading. Start at the outside water edge of your float and softly pat or mop up the excess water, blending towards the painted edge of the float. Use the 18/0 liner for the thinner lines on the window panes and chimney as well as the lace on the curtains. The stylus is used to create the dots of flowers. The stippler is used to create flowers. Use the small stencil brush for dry-brush highlighting. The #12 fabric round is used to apply the antiquing. Spatter with an old toothbrush.

BASECOAT

Base the building with a wash of Light Avocado, try to make the wash light enough for the wood grain to show through. Base the chimneys Deep Burgundy and the roof Mississippi Mud with Buttermilk trim. Base the canopy Khaki Tan and Buttermilk. Base the door Evergreen, the window Graphite, the step Mississippi Mud, and the trim Buttermilk. Base all the windows Graphite, the shutters Evergreen, and the window boxes Khaki Tan. All trim and window panes are Buttermilk. The curtain area is a wash of Buttermilk. The lace is done with thinned Buttermilk and the 18/0 liner. Base the birds Graphite with Moon Yellow beaks.

SHADE, HIGHLIGHT, & DETAIL

Shade the window edges Lamp Black. Shade under each shingle on the roof with Burnt Umber. Dry-brush highlight on the front edge of each shingle with Khaki Tan. Shade the canopy sections with Burnt Umber. Dry-brush highlights with Buttermilk. Make brick lines on the chimneys with thinned Buttermilk and shade

the bottom of the chimney where it meets the roof with Graphite. Shade under the roof on the front of the building, under all of the window trim, under the flower boxes, under the canopy, to the left of the shutters, canopy, door and window with Evergreen and then reinforce with Burnt Umber. Shade the bottom of each bird with Lamp Black. Using the liner, paint the word "Espresso" in the window using Tangelo Orange. Go back over the writing with thinned Deep Burgundy. Shade on the door under the trim and above the step with Lamp Black.

Base the credit cards in the window Buttermilk. The top band on the Visa card and the word "Visa" are Deep Midnight Blue, the bottom band is Antique Gold. The Mastercard circles are painted Deep Burgundy and Antique Gold. Run a squiggly line through the circles to suggest the lettering with Buttermilk.

SHOP SIGN

Base the sign Light Avocado. Base the sun Antique Gold, highlight with Tangelo Orange on the top curved edge, and drybrush highlight in the center with Buttermilk. The lettering is painted using a liner and thinned Buttermilk. The border line around the lettering is Evergreen, except the bottom line which is Buttermilk. Shade under the top border line with Evergreen.

FLOWERS

Using wood glue, glue all flower boxes to their appropriate places. The leaves in the window boxes are started by stippling with Evergreen, and then again with Light Avocado. Stipple the flowers using Deep Burgundy, while brush is still dirty, pick up Buttermilk and add some more lighter pink flowers. Using a stylus and Buttermilk, add the white flowers by dotting randomly in little clusters. The flowers next to the door on the ground are started by making dots of Burnt Umber for the centers; the petals are pulled dots of Antique Gold and Moon Yellow. Using a liner and Evergreen pull stems of flowers down from each flowers center. Stipple along the ground under the flowers with Evergreen and again lightly with Buttermilk.

EASY FINISH

Wood-glue the roof, canopy, and door to their appropriate places; clamp pieces down until dry. Using the .05 ZIG black pen, add the door numbers and outline the main lines of the design and the address on the door. The .03 ZIG black pen is used to outline the window panes and to create a drop shadow to the left and bottom of each letter of the sign. Lightly sand the paint from the edges of the building, roof, door, and canopy. Wipe free of dust. Spray with Krylon Matte Spray Finish. Using DecoArt Dark Chocolate stencil paint and the fabric round, antique around the edges of the building. Spatter the project using a toothbrush and Lamp Black, spatter again with Buttermilk. Spray again with Matte Finish. Hammer the carpet tack into the door. Paint the head of the carpet tack with Glorious Gold Metallic paint.





PREP STEP

Sand and tack the birdhouse. Make a 1:1 mixture of wood sealer and Driftwood and base the birdhouse sides and bottom. Transfer the outline for the windows. Fill windows and base the roof and front step Neutral Grey. The roof is covered with

DecoArt Grey Sparkling Sandstones, following manufacturer's instructions.

PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

With the exception of the Blue Jay, all beaks and feet are undercoated with White. Base the beaks and feet Marigold, shade with Honey Brown, and highlight with White. Unless otherwise stated, eyes are White with Black pupils and a White reflection dot. All teeth and water drops are White and outlined with Black. Base the bars on the cell windows Shimmering Silver, highlight with White, and outline with Black. For straighter bar lines, use a ruler to transfer the pattern. Thin paint for floating by putting a tiny drip of *DecoArt* Easy Float on the palette, then adding a bit of color. Sideload on a barely damp, clean brush.

FRONT (#1 PATTERN)

Highlight the top step with a dry brush of White slanting the strokes to the left. Detail the front edge of the step with a fine line of White. Detail the back edge of the step against the wall with a fine line of Black.

Transfer the pattern to the front of the birdhouse. Base the sign White and add Black lettering.

"Gotti Kawt Crow": Base the inner mouth White + a touch of Spice Pink; highlight with White. Base the top of the head, hands, and tail Black. The eyebrows and outline of the fingers are Driftwood. The prison clothes are alternate stripes of Black and White. Shade with Driftwood and detail with Black. Base the knotted sheets White, shade with Grey Sky, and detail with Black.

"Blue Bird Guard": Base the body Baby Blue, shade with True Blue, highlight with White, and add details with Black. Dot the eyes Black with White reflections dots. Float thinned Spice Pink over the cheeks. Anger spiral of smoke above head is Black. Base gun barrel Shimmering Silver and the stock Honey Brown. Highlight with White and detail with Black.

Guard Hats: (Also for flamingo.) Base True Blue with a White band. The emblem is Shimmering Silver with fine Black scribbling. Highlight the top edges of the blue bird's hat and right edges of the flamingo's hat with White.

RIGHT SIDE #2 PATTERN

"Hank the Prankster" top cell: Base Salem Blue, shade with Desert Turquoise, highlight with White, and detail with Black. The inner mouth is White + a touch of Spice Pink. Base the tongue Spice Pink + a touch of Brilliant Red, highlight with White, and add action lines with Black. Base the water balloon Kelly Green + a touch of Black. Shade the left side with a float of Black and highlight the right side with White. Base the hat

with alternate stripes of Black and White.

"Bugsy Buzzard" bottom cell: Base the head and neck Spice Pink with White neck feathers. Base the wings Black and the body Grey Sky. Highlight the very top of the wings and fingers with Grey Sky and detail with Black.

Flamingo Guard: Base the body Spice Pink, the upper bill White, and the lower bill Black. The glasses are White with Grey Sky right edges. The hat is the same as the Blue Bird. Base the cover of the book in a mix of White + a touch of Kelly Green. The inner pages are White with Black lettering and details.

BACK-#3 PATTERN

"Punky Vulture" top cell: Base the lower body and head Grey Sky. Base the teeth, nails, neck, eyes, and undercoat hair White. Base the hair Kelly Green. While still wet, blend a tiny bit of White on the right side. The iris of the eyes are Baby Blue. The pickle in the vulture's left hand is a mix of Marigold + a touch of Kelly Green. Add details with Black.

"Pickpocket Parrot" center cell: Undercoat head, tongue, chest, and bowl White. Base the head, tongue, and bottom stripe of the bowl Brilliant Red. Shade with Brilliant Red + a touch of Black, and highlight with White. Base the body True Blue around the white chest area. Add a few Kelly Green feathers in the True Blue areas. Chest area is Cadmium Yellow with tiny liner strokes of Brilliant Red. The tray and spoon are Shimmering Silver. Highlight the top of the spoon with White. Top stripe of bowl is White and center stripe is Black. Bowl contents are Honey Brown. Steam rising from bowl and popping bubbles are done with White and a fine liner. Seat under parrot is Honey Brown detailed with Black.

"Eagle Eye" bottom cell: Base head White; shade with Grey Sky. Base the T-shirt Baby Blue, shade with True Blue. Base the body Honey Brown, shade with Burnt Umber, highlight with White. The hat is the same as Hank's. Undercoat the tattoo White and base Brilliant Red. The lettering is White. Detail eagle in Black. Base the worm with a mix of Kelly Green + a little Marigold (medium green), shade under the worm with a float of Neutral Grey. Detail with Black and highlight with White. Pull up grass with liner strokes of medium green mix.

LEFT SIDE- #4 PATTERN

"Capo de Crow" top cell: Base the body and derby Black, highlight with

Grey Sky. Base the hat band True Blue + a little White (medium blue mix). Shade with a float of True Blue on the left side. Highlight the right edge of band with White. Glasses are floated White, and lower 1/3 is floated with Neutral Grey. Undercoat shirt with White. Add alternate bands of White and Brilliant Red. Shade with floated Neutral Grey. Highlight top of right sleeve with White. Base cigar Honey Brown, undercoat tip with White and base Brilliant Red. Shade with Burnt Umber and highlight top edge of cigar and make rising smoke line with White.

"Chicken Lips Cardinal" bottom cell: Undercoat with White. Base feet, beak, gun handle, and whistle note Black. Mix True Blue + White to base top of head, back of neck, wing area closest to body, and the tip of the tail. Fill sections of wings and tail with Salem Blue. Shade with True Blue. Shade white area with Grey Sky. Gun belt is Honey Brown with Black lettering and detailing. Badge and whistle are Shimmering Silver; highlight top with White. Draw whistle string, action lines, and add details with Black.

PREP STEP

Sand and tack the brush caddy. Seal with *DecoArt* Multi-Purpose Sealer. Allow to dry and lightly sand again. Wipe with the tack cloth again.

PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

Please refer to the pattern for dotting and "x"ing, which indicates exact areas of shading and highlighting. Dots indicate shaded areas and "x"s indicate highlighted areas. Base the top half of the caddy Buttermilk and the bottom half Camel; allow to dry. To insure a nice straight line, use blue masking tape.

SIDE ONE

Using 3/4" masking tape, mask off the upper half of the front side of the brush box. Shade alternate stripes with Camel. With thinned Antique Green and a liner brush, paint vines on alternate, unshaded stripes. With a side-loaded brush, shade leaves with Antique Green. Allow to dry and shade the opposite side of the leaves with Colonial Green. Base the flowers with thinned Rookwood Red. Dip-dot the center of the flowers with Snow White. Base the chair rail with Antique Green.

Base the mice Grey Sky and shade with Neutral Grey. Blush cheeks and ears with Rookwood Red. Base the banner Light Buttermilk and shade with Burnt Umber. Shade around the mice and banner with Burnt Umber.

SIDE TWO

Refer to Side One to paint the top half, chair rail, and mouse.

Base the bottle of paint, puddles of paint, and the foot tracks Colonial Green. Shade with Antique Teal and highlight with Ice Blue. Base the label on the paint bottle with the following colors: Heritage Brick, Hauser Dark Green, Glorious Gold, Navy Blue, and Snow White. Base the cap on the bottle with Snow White and shade with Buttermilk. Base the picture frame with Heritage Brick. Base the middle of the picture Snow White. Shade the picture and frame with Burnt Umber. Base the nail in the wall with Shimmering Silver. Dip-dot the nail heads on the picture frame with a stylus and Glorious Gold. Shade around the picture and mouse with Burnt Umber.

SIDE THREE

Refer to Side One to paint the top half, chair rail, and mouse.

Base the tube of paint and "no swimming" sign with Snow White. Base the label on the paint tube Heritage Brick and Lamp Black. The paint coming out of the tube is Heritage Brick. Using thinned Light Buttermilk and a liner brush, paint the highlight on the paint. Shade all of the above and around all of the above with Burnt Umber. Base the brush handle and bristles Lamp Black. Base the ferule of the brush and screw opening of the paint tube with Shimmering Silver. Highlight handle with Grey Sky. Shade the glass with Colonial Blue and shade the water in the glass with Ice Blue. Shade around the glass with Burnt Umber.

SIDE FOUR

Refer to Side One to paint the top half, chair rail, and mouse.

Paint the picture and paint puddle the same as on Side Two. Paint the brush the same as on side three.

EASY FINISH

Finish all pen work with Koh-I-Noor Rapidograph .35 and .50 pens as indicated on the pattern, using straight edges wherever necessary for straight




lines. Tacky-glue the mice heads into place and allow to dry. Lightly spray the entire caddy with Krylon #1311 Matte Spray.

PREP STEP

Sand the wooden tray; wipe clean. Base the tray with several coats of Silver Sage Green sanding gently between coats. Wipe away dust and apply a "skeleton" pattern, omitting all details. Transfer details as needed.

LEAVES

Double-load with Hauser Dark Green and Jade Green and tip into Titanium White. Stroke the elongated leaves. Outline the leaves with Navy Blue. Refer to worksheet.

TULIPS

Double-load the 1/2" brush with Baby Pink and Plum and stroke in the "c" strokes with Plum to the outside. Refer to worksheet.

With the #4 round mixtique brush, stroke in the center comma stroke using Baby Pink. Start at the large end and pull the brush to a point. Outline in Navy Blue. Refer to worksheet.

Double-dip the wooden handle in Titanium White and Moon Yellow and make descending dots in the middle of the tulip center. Add Baby Pink curved commas at the end of each tulip. Refer to worksheet.

BOWS

Double-load the #4 round brush with Baby Pink and Plum. Pull the first part of the bow with the Baby Pink on top. Turn the brush over and stroke the bottom stroke making sure the light colors connect at the corners of the bow. Connect the edge of the bow with a fine line of Baby Pink. Allow to dry. Shade with a float of Navy Blue. Refer to worksheet.

Second technique for doing the bow: Base with Baby Pink. Float Plum on the shaded sides of the bow. Allow to dry and float Navy Blue for additional shading. See Illustration for placement.

BLUE "SCATTER" FLOWERS

The blue "scatter" flowers are done with the #2 flat brush. There are two options: 1. Double-load brush with Navy Blue and Titanium White and stroke from the outside to the center making either four or five stroke flowers. 2. Load the brush with Navy Blue and stroke all the petals of one flower. Clean the brush and load Titanium White and immediately stroke over the Navy Blue petals.

The centers are dabs of Moon Yellow and Titanium White.

Outline all in thinned Navy Blue using the script liner brush.

EASY FINISH

Spray with several light coats of DecoArt Matte Spray Sealer/Finisher. Sand lightly after five or six coats and before the last coat of spray finisher.





To soften float: When loading a flat brush for floating, soften the color by blending it longer on the palette until the color becomes lighter. The goal is to create a float using less color.

Base the hat with Spice Tan. Spatter the hat with Burnt Sienna and then with Butter Cream. Wipe off any extra spatters on the face and ears. Shade the hat above the eyes with Golden Brown. Shade the top of the hat and the sides next to the face with Burnt Sienna. Line the hat with Burnt Sienna.

PREP STEP

Transfer the main pattern outline from the pattern packet to 1/4" Baltic birch plywood. To cut an accurate hole for the light, position the front of the light on wood and trace around it before cutting (the lights may vary in size depending on the brand you buy). Cut with the scroll saw. Sand with fine sandpaper and wipe clean. Seal with wood sealer, sand again, and wipe clean. Transfer the main pattern outlines. Transfer details as needed.

PAINTING TIPS

Dry-brushing highlights: Use a round Chinese bristle; they come in several different sizes. Using no water, dip the brush into the paint. Pounce out most of the paint on a paper towel, leaving just a hint of color on the brush. On the area to be highlighted, scrub or pounce the brush back and forth in a circular motion. The goal is to create a soft, feathery highlight.

FLOWER

Base the flower Tide Pool. Dry-brush the middle with Butter Cream. Shade the outer petals with Blueberry, and inner petals with Grape. Dot the middle with Yellow.

FACE AND EARS

Base the face and ears with Butter Cream. Dry-brush the middle of the ears and shade the top and bottom of the face with Medium Flesh. Shade the eyelids with softened Rouge. Dry-brush the cheeks and halfway up the middle of the ears with Rouge. Base the eyes with Blueberry. Shade the bottom of the eyes and line the lashes with Black. Shade between the teeth with a softened float of Black. Dry-brush the criss-cross highlight on the left ear with White. Line the bangs and float short highlights near the top of the eyes with White. Paint the mouth Black. Add dots to the eyes and cheeks also with White. Line the ears with Medium Flesh.




FINISHING TOUCHES

Brush a little varnish on the flower and highlights on ear and eyes. Before varnish dries, pick up some glitter with the same brush and apply to wet varnished areas. Using a clean brush, damp with water, wipe off any extra glitter. Spatter pieces with Black. Glue on flower with wood glue. Apply several coats of varnish. Push light through hole and tack with hot glue on back.

Base the face and hands Medium Flesh and the hair Light Chocolate. Base the collar Old Parchment, the button Seagrass, and the wooden spoon Maple Sugar Tan.

Base the inside of the sign Raw Linen. The alternate checks on the sign border are Wedgewood Blue and White,

Base the nose and the heart on the sign Barn Red.

Lightly sand the project with fine-grit sandpaper.

SHADING

Shade around mom's chin, collar, button, hands, and spoon with Dark Brown.

DETAILS

Use the tip of the stylus to add White polka-dots to the collar. Dot the eyes and the button with Black. Use a cotton swab with a circular motion to add cheeks with Pink artist's chalk.

Use the .05 Sakura Pigma Micron black pen to draw swirls in mom's hair, connect the button's holes and add the lettering with "stitches."

Use the .01 Sakura Pigma Micron black pen to outline the entire project. Draw stitch lines around the collar, sign, and heart as shown.



shown. Spray the entire project to seal the chalk and the linework with Delta Satin Finish. Use a good wood glue to attach the pin on the backside of the pin. (Note: Attatch the pin back behind mom's head for good balance.)

PREP STEP

Sand the wood pieces lightly with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Seal with Delta Ceramcoat All-Purpose Sealer. Allow to dry and lightly sand again; wipe clean.

BASECOAT

Use the 3/4" basecoating flat to base the outside edge and back of the tray and the upper and lower midring sections of the candlestick Pale Lilac. Refer to picture for placement.

Base the inside section of the tray, the entire mid section of the candlesticks, and the second ring from the bottom of the candlesticks Old Parchment. Refer to picture for placement.

Base the top and bottom rings of the candlesticks Lemon Grass.

CANDLESTICK DETAILS

Apply the pattern to the candlestick. Using your round brush, paint Pink Quartz dots on the Pale Lilac top ring.

Using the hole in the candlestick as the starting place, paint freehand flowers and leaves on the four sides of the Pale Lilac bottom ring. The flowers are Pink Quartz and the flower centers are White. The leaves are Lemon Grass. Use the liner brush to line the top and bottom of the leaves with Apple Green and the center with Light Foliage Green.

On the Old Parchment ring, paint vertical lines approximately 1/2" apart from the top with the round brush. You might find it easier to divide the candle in four, starting with the hole in the back, and then paint the lines in between the four starting lines.

Using Fuchsia, paint the scalloped design around the top of the bottom ring of the candlestick with the round

brush. When dry, paint White comma strokes on the bottom of each swoop using your liner brush; refer to the worksheet.

With your round brush, place White dots randomly around the bottom section of the candlestick beneath the Fuchsia scallops. Paint the vertical plaid section in the middle of the candlestick Pale Lilac; let dry. Paint the vertical and horizontal lines Lemon Grass with the liner brush.

Paint the flower Pink Quartz, the flower center Pale Lilac, and the leaves and vines Lemon Grass.

Use the round brush to paint the dragonfly body Lemon Grass and the wings Pale Lilac. Sideload the #10 flat and shade the bottom of the flower center with Lilac; let dry, shade again with Deep Lilac. Sideload the #10 flat with Fuchsia and shade around the flower center. When dry, paint "ushape" around each petal where it meets the center. Refer to the worksheet for example.

Sideload the #10 flat and highlight the top petals and top of the leaves with White.

Using the liner brush, paint wavy lines around the flower with White. Paint a comma-shaped stroke in the center with White. Refer to the photo and worksheet for placement. This is an easy freehand design. Don't worry about perfection!

Using your liner brush, paint wavy lines and center with Light Foliage Green. With the #10 flat and Deep Lilac, shade (sideload) where the dragonfly wings meet the body. When dry, shade the bottom edge of the wings. Paint a line along the bottom edge of the body.

TRAY DETAIL

Using the handle of your brush, paint White dots randomly in the center of the tray. With your round brush, paint a freehand circle with Pink Quartz. Place the flowers at 12 o'clock, 3 o'clock, 6 o'clock, and 9 o'clock. Then paint a

flower in between each. (Don't worry if it is not perfect.) With your liner brush, paint a swirl of White in your still-wet Pink Quartz flower. With your round brush paint leaves with Apple Green. Using your liner brush, outline edges loosely and paint the center line. With your brush handle, paint three dots in White in between each flower in a triangle shape.

EASY FINISH


When dry (I suggest waiting 24 hours), varnish each piece with at least three coats. I like a gloss finish to these pieces, but use satin if you prefer a softer finish. Hint: If you get melted wax on your candlesticks, simply stick them in the freezer. After about an hour the wax will pop right off!





FROG CUBE

WOOD BLANKS

Sand the edges of the cube with 150grit sandpaper. Base the entire box Coastline Blue; let dry. Transfer the frog pattern to the top of the cube.

Use the #6 shader to paint the frog Spring Green, the four large hearts Tompte Red, and the four small hearts Pink Quartz.

Use a small stencil brush to apply the checks around the top sides with Blueberry. Use the #6 shader to paint the box legs with Blueberry. Dot in between the checks with White, and allow to dry.

Use the #1 script liner to paint the eyes White. When dry, paint the inside with Black, then add White highlights.

Use the 1/2" angular shader to shade the frog with Deep River Green and highlight with Lemon Grass. Dry-brush his cheeks with Garnet Red stencil creme. Use the #1 script liner to paint his bow with thinned Tompte Red. Use the same brush to paint his mouth with thinned Black. Dot his cheeks with White.

Use the 1/2" angular shader to shade around the top of the cube with Blueberry. Use the same brush to shade the red hearts with Candy Bar and highlight with Perfect Highlight for Red. Shade all the pink hearts with Fuchsia and highlight with White.

Paint small curly circles on the sides of the cube with thinned Leaf Green using a #1 script liner. Paint small circles on the frog with Lemon Grass. Dot inside the circles with Lemon Grass.

EASY FINISH

Glue the hearts in place (one side at a time) allow each side to dry. Spatter the entire cube with White, then Black. Seal with Delta Satin Finish Sealer. When dry, assemble the box and fill with valentine goodies for that special someone!

EASTER BUNNY CUBE

Sand the edges of the cube with 150grit sandpaper. Base the entire cube Light Ivory; let dry. Transfer bunny pattern to the top of the cube.

Use the #6 shader to base the bunny Maple Sugar Tan. Use the same brush to paint the curvy line around the box top sides, and the legs of the box with Pink Quartz.

Use the #6 shader to paint the six eggs: two with Pink Quartz, two with Crocus Yellow, and two with Pale Lilac.

Use the #1 script liner to paint the bunny's nose Pink Quartz. Paint his mouth, eyes, and eyebrows with thinned Black. Paint his hair with thinned Burnt Sienna, his bow with Eggplant, and his whiskers with thinned White.

Use the 1/2" angular shader to shade the the bunny with Burnt Sienna and highlight him with Fuchsia. Shade around the box top with Burnt Sienna and along his nose and inside his ears with Fuchsia. Dry-brush his cheeks with Garnet Red stencil creme.

Use the 1/2" angular shader to shade the yellow eggs with Burnt Sienna, the purple eggs with Eggplant, and the pink eggs with Fuchsia. Highlight all the eggs with White. Use the #1 script liner to paint the line design on the eggs with thinned White.

WOOD BLANK

To order the wood blank for this project, send \$22.99 to Cabin Crafters, 1225 W. 1st Street, Nevada, IA 50201. Call (800) 669-3920 or (515) 382-5406.

PREP STEP

Use graphite paper to transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. The sides of the box are cut from 3/8" pine. The eleven eggs and the paws are cut from 1/8" Baltic birch plywood. To cut three to four eggs at one time, and both paws at once, place small tabs of double-stick carpet tape between wood layers before cutting. Cut out all the pieces with a scroll saw. Mark placement for the wood plug nose; drill a 3/32" hole in the spot and wood-glue the plug into place.

Sand all the pieces well, first with 150-grit then with 200-grit; wipe clean. Wood-glue the four sides of the box together; secure with the brads. Use this open box as a pattern to cut the base. Wood-glue and brad the base into place. Set all the brads with a nail-set. Fill the holes and any gaps with wood filler; when the wood filler dries, sand again and wipe clean.

BASECOAT

Transfer the line separating the bunny from the box. Base above the line, and the separate paws with Light Ivory and below the line and the box inside and out with Eucalyptus. Base the scallops along the upper edge of the box with Moss Green. Basecoat the top and bottom sections of the eggs the bunny is holding with Coastline Blue and the middle section with Light Ivory. Base the eggs as follows: two with Coastline Blue, two with Pale Lilac, two with Santa's Flesh; two with Touch O' Pink, two with Light Ivory, and one with Chamomile. Transfer the main pattern lines to each egg, and to the bunny.

BUNNY

Float shade on the inner ears with Touch O' Pink. Deepen the shading at the top with Sachet Pink. Paint the nose plug Touch O' Pink, the mouth Sachet Pink, and the eyes and mouth opening Black. Line the eyebrows and mouth with slightly-thinned Black. Float shading on the lower part of the nose and dry-brush the cheek blush with Sachet Pink. With Light Ivory, dry-brush a highlight on the center of the nose and dot a highlight on each cheek and each eye as shown. Float Drizzle Grey shading on the paws, between the ears, and next to the egg he is holding.

Lightly transfer the two horizontal lines on the center of the eggs on the backboard. Lay in the three rows of alternating checks freehand, using the #4 flat shader and Maple Sugar. Line on either side of the checked section with Cape Cod Blue, then scatter tiny Sachet Pink hearts on the blue sections. To form the hearts, use the stylus to place two small dots of paint side-by-side; while the paint is wet, pull down a point between the dots with the smallest end of the stylus.

BOX PLAID

Transfer the grid from the pattern section to the box. With the #8 flat used flat, and slightly thinned Moss Green, follow the lines of the gridfirst the vertical, then the horizontal lines. When this paint is dry, thin Eucalyptus slightly and line through the center of the broader lines. Dot with Eucalyptus where the lines cross.

COASTLINE BLUE EGGS

Base the tops of the eggs Santa's Flesh, the lower sections Cape Cod Blue, and the wavy lines Light Ivory. Use the wood end of a brush to dot the center blue section with Rosetta Pink. Dot around the Rosetta Pink with eight small Light Ivory dots. Dot Cape Cod Blue line on the upper section of the egg, and Santa's Flesh on the lower section.



Mark placement, and staying well within bounds, carefully sand away paint where the eggs and the paws will be glued; glue will not bond permanently to the painted areas. With wood glue, attach the paws and the eggs. Cut a piece of coordinating fabric ½" x 6". Tie a bow from the fabric and attach it under the chin with thick craft glue. When the glue is dry, spray the box on all sides with *Delta* Satin Interior Varnish; let dry and spray again.

PREP STEP

Use FolkArt ClearCote Matte Sealer to seal all surfaces; sand when dry.

PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

Base the top of the lid Baby Blue; shade the edges with Sterling Blue. Stipple the center with Wicker White. Stencil the lettering with Wicker White. Shade the left edge of each letter with Linen. Shade on the lid under the right side of each letter with Sterling Blue.

Base the beehive French Vanilla; shade the bottom of each crease with Buttercrunch + English Mustard.

Base the bees' bodies French Vanilla; shade the edges with Buttercrunch + English Mustard. Base the heads and stripes Licorice. Base the wings Wicker White; shade against the bodies with Linen. Add antennae with ink and dot the tips with Licorice.

Base the routed edge on the lid Summer Sky, shade the top and bottom edges with Teal Green, and stipple the center with Wicker White.

Base the sides of the lid French Vanilla. Shade the top and bottom edges Buttercrunch + English Mustard. Stipple the center with Wicker White. Using transparent tape, tape off every other check. Stipple the exposed area with Wicker White. Note: I had to "fib" a bit on the very end sections and made the center check a bit narrower than the others. Shade the left edge of each yellow check Buttercrunch + English Mustard. Shade the left edge of each white check Linen. Paint a dip-dot heart of Licorice in the fourth from the right check on the front edge of the box. Dot each bottom right corner of each yellow check with Wicker White.

Base the center section of the box Baby Blue. Shade the top and bottom of the sides with Sterling Blue. Stipple the center with Wicker White.

Base the bottom section of the box Summer Sky. Shade the top and bottom edges of the sides with Teal Green. Stipple the center Wicker White. Use the #0 shader with a wash of Wicker White to add the horizontal and vertical stripes as shown on the pattern. Line next to this on both sides with Teal Green.



INKING

Using ink, add the dash lines for the bee trails. Outline all letters and wings for bees with a solid line. Ink outside each of these with a broken wiggly line interrupted with dots and dashes. Ink on edges of the lid, top, and bottom of the routed edge on the lid, sides of lid, and side of box with a broken wiggly line interrupted with dots and dashes.

EASY FINISH

Adhere the bees and beehives to the box. Tip an old toothbrush into water. Swirl in a puddle of Wicker White. Tap out on a paper towel to remove excess paint. With the bristles facing your wood pieces, drag your index finger across the bristles flicking paint on the surface. If your spots are too big and disappear, you have too much water. If they are too small you need to add more water to your paint. Spray varnish with 3-4 light coats of *FolkArt* Clearcote Matte Sealer.



PREP STEP

or (515) 382-5406.

See the exploded perspective illustration in the pattern packet for building instructrions. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean.

PAINTING

Base the dress part of the box Trail. Base the head and neck Fleshtone and the wings Butter Cream.

DRESS

Use a #16 flat and thinned AC Flesh to paint the plaid on the dress. When dry, reinforce the squares where the plaid lines cross using AC Flesh.

Add pattern for cherries and heart patch. Base the patch AC Flesh. Shade around the outside edge of the patch with Territorial Beige.

HEART

Base the heart AC Flesh + Tomato Spice, shade with Barn Red, and highlight with AC Flesh + a tad of Tomato Spice.

CHERRIES & CHECKERS

Base the cherries Tomato Spice, shade with a sideload of Barn Red, and highlight with a sideload of Tomato Spice + AC Flesh. Base the leaves with slightly thinned Dark Forest Green. Highlight with Dark Forest Greren + Butter Cream. The stems are done with the liner and Dark Forest Green + Barn Red.

Base the checkers Black.

FACE, HAIR & HALO

Use the #6 filbert and stroke the nose using Fleshtone + Burnt Sienna. The cheeks are a wash of Tomato Spice + Fleshtone. The eyes are Black.

Add the hair with thinned Terra Cotta. Cut 16-gauge wire and fashion curls; glue ends into holes on top of head. Adjust as desired.

Bend 16-gauge wire into spiral and stick into a hair hole for the halo. Drybrush using Turquoise.

EASY FINISH

Glue the wings to the back of the angel. Add inkwork to checks, cherries, and heart. (Use the pattern for a guide.) Tie fabric strip around the neck and fill with your special note paper, candles, or even your favorite herbs for the kitchen counter.



























The white scalloped wood basket can be found at your local Target store. This design can easily be adapted to any shape basket.

PREP STEP

Clean the basket before painting with a clean cloth. Trace and transfer the pattern.

FLOWERS

Double-load the 3/4" flat with Wicker White and Berry Wine. With Wicker White to the outer edge, paint the five petals to form the flower. To paint petals, start on the chisel edge then lean bristles on side, slide bristles up, then as you come around return to chisel position. Make sure that all strokes meet at one point in the middle. Refer to the color worksheet.

To paint the buds, paint three to four strokes meeting at one point. Dip the end of the brush handle into School Bus Yellow. Dot the flower centers.

LEAVES

Use the 3/4" flat for large leaves and the #12 flat for the smaller leaves. Double-load the 3/4" flat with Thicket, Wicker White, and a touch of School Bus Yellow on the Wicker White side. With Thicket to the outer edge, push, wiggle and slide to brush tip to paint one side of leaf. Repeat to paint other side. Refer to color worksheet.

To paint onestroke leaves, with same brush (or if you want smaller leaves), load #12 flat with Thicket, Wicker White, and a touch

of School Bus Yellow on Wicker White side. With Thicket to the outer edge, start on chisel, lean bristles on side then push, turn and pull to brush tip. On chisel edge leading with Wicker White, pull stem into leaves. Refer to color worksheet.

With same brush, on chisel edge, touch base of bud and pull three to four strokes to form calyx at bottom of bud. Then pull stem. Refer to color worksheet.



BLACK OUTLINE AND PLAID

Load the #2 script liner with inky Licorice. Paint outline of flowers and leaves. Load 3/4" brush with Inca Gold. Paint big stripes down and across. With brush on chisel edge, paint thin stripes down and across. Allow to dry.

EASY FINISH

Finish with two to three coats of acrylic matte sealer.
