TO ORDER

To order the wood blank for this project, contact Decor Delights, P.O. Box 526054, Salt Lake City, UT 84152. Call (801) 262-9451 or visit: www.decordelights.com.

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. Cut the palette from 3/4" pine and the brush from 1/2" pine. Cut out both pieces with a scroll saw. Sand with 220-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Seal with all-purpose sealer using a #12 flat; let dry. Lightly sand again.

PALETTE

Base the top of the palette Lemon Grass. Transfer main pattern outlines. Transfer details as needed.

Using the #3 white bristle brush, lightly stipple where the flowers will be painted with Dark Foliage Green. Sideload/float shade here and there on the edge of the wood and base the back and sides of the palette with the same.

FLOWERS

Base all the flowers with an undercoat of White. Base the red flower with the #10 filbert and Berry Red. Let dry and repeat with another coat of paint. Using the #4 filbert, load with Berry Red and pick up some White on the tip of the brush. Tap a few times on your palette paper to blend. Add two strokes on each petal to make the highlights.

The strokes should begin just inside the petal and then lift up before going all the way to the center of the flower. The highlight should look like it is in the center of each petal. The strokes are sloppy commas and should have no tails on

them. The highlights look best if the strokes are executed the same way on each flower (stroke left first, then right, move to next petal, etc.)

The remaining flowers will be painted the same way with the following base colors: Wisteria, Bungalow Blue, Yellow, and Pumpkin. Repeat the highlighting steps as above for each color.

Using White, line around each petal with a skinny-fat-skinny "c" stroke that has a dip in the middle.

Flower centers: Lightly stipple the center of each flower with Burnt Sienna. Keep paint in the brush, don't rinse out.

Pick up Yellow in this same brush with Burnt Sienna and tap the excess off on your palette paper.

Lightly stipple this highlight color in the center of each flower. Be sure to let some of the Burnt Sienna background show through. Keep paint in the brush, don't rinse out.

Pick up White with this same brush and tap the excess off on your palette paper. Lightly stipple this highlight color in the center of each flower. Be sure to let some of the background colors show through.

Leaves: Using the #4 filbert, stroke in the leaves with Dark Foliage Green. Line the veins of each leaf with a 1:1 mix of Dark Foliage Green + Lemon Grass.

BRUSH

Base the handle Berry Red. The bristles are Yellow. Base the ferrule Metallic Silver. Sideload/float shade the handle where it meets the ferrule with a mix of Berry Red + touch of Dark Foliage Green. Use this same color to add in the two lines on the ferrule.

Sideload/float shade the bristles where they meet the ferrule and a little bit down the right side of the bristles with Burnt Sienna. Load a liner with the same


color and add a few individual bristles.

Sideload/float highlight the tip of the bristles and a little on the left side of the bristles with a 1:1 mix of Yellow + White. Line in a highlight on the handle of the brush with White.

FINISHING

Let the project dry completely. Finish both pieces with satin varnish.

Attach all the hardware. Attach your keys and enjoy your new key holder!



WOOD BLANK

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to 1/2" pine or Baltic birch plywood for the shell piece. Cut out with a scroll saw. The hole in the top of the center shell is 5/16" wide and 11/2" deep, drilled at a slight angle. The base piece is 3¾" x 3½".

Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Seal with DecoArt All-Purpose Wood Sealer. Sand again lightly when dry. Wipe clean.

BASECOAT

Basecoat the shell piece Light Buttermilk. The bottom base piece is painted Cashmere Beige. Transfer details as needed.

CENTER SHELL

Using the 1/2" rake and thinned Gingerbread, rake horizontally across the top of each shell section. Curve these lines just a little to give the shell dimension. With the dirty brush, add thinned Georgia Clay to the rake and move down into the center of the shell. Load the 3/4" flat with Georgia Clay, then add a touch of Antique Rose. Move into the paint, as you blend on the palette to create a very wide sideload. Float the very bottom of the shell

with this mix, starting with the paint side of the brush in the triangle created by all three shells.

Using the #10 flat and Red Iron Oxide, shade against each dividing line on both sides, letting the float fade off as you get to the center. Next, float next to the front shells and into the deep triangle again with Rookwood Red. This float should help to set this shell behind the other two. You may want to repeat this float after the front two shells are detailed. Finally, load the 1/8" DM stippler with Titanium (Snow) White and stipple the center four sections with a highlight that is wider at the top and narrower as you move to the bottom, before you get to the shaded area.

RIGHT SIDE SHELL

Using Burnt Sienna and the 18/0 liner, outline the entire shell. Using a wash of Gingerbread, fill in each section, leaving the Light Buttermilk showing between the double lines. Shade the bottom of each section with Burnt Sienna using a "c" stroke to apply these shadows. This will create the curve in the shell. Also, shade with this color under the neck or opening in the shell. Shade inside the mouth of the shell with Gingerbread plus a touch of Antique Rose.

Dot the tip of the shell using Burnt Sienna and the end of the liner brush handle. Using Burnt Umber, darken the shades at the tip of the shell and under each section as you move to the opening. Stipple the highlights on the top five sections with Titanium (Snow) White using the 1/8" DM stippler. You may need to do these twice for brightness.

With your finger, wipe off the dot at the tip of the shell. Only the center, which is still wet, should come off, leaving a perfect circle. Shade this circle with Burnt Umber. Shade the bottom of the opening with Antique Rose to darken this area.

LEFT SIDE SHELL

Sideload the 3/4" flat with Driftwood plus a little Mississippi Mud. Shade from the bottom of the opening around the curve to about 6 o'clock. Load the 3/8" stippler with the same mix. Wipe almost dry on a paper towel and then rub in the center shadow from about 12 o'clock around the shell to about 2 o'clock. Keep the color in the center of the shell.

Using the 18/0 liner and Mississippi Mud, outline the center curl in the shell and the tiny, darker curved lines in the center. Using the 3/8" stippler and Mississippi Mud, stipple a darker area just right of the opening. Now, thin the Mississippi Mud and use the 18/0 liner to paint the faint curved lines all the way around the shell. These are shape lines and need to be curved like the shell.

Shade the opening of the shell with Coral Rose. When dry, sideload with Coral Rose and a touch of Antique Rose and float the bottom of the opening again. Use Mississippi Mud to shade on the shell just behind the right side shell.

Load the 1/8" DM stippler with Titanium (Snow) White, and stipple the highlight in the shell from 2 o'clock to 8 o'clock. This will need to be done twice, letting it dry between coats.

EASY FINISH

Glue the shells to the back edge of the base. For a more permanent bond, drill two 1/8" holes countersunk on the back side and attach the two wood pieces with 1" screws. Spray with two coats of DecoArt Matte Spray Sealer and attach Post-it sheets and a pencil to complete.

PROJECT BLANKS

Most of the other materials can be found at your local discount or crafts store.

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to 1/8" wood. Cut out using a scroll saw. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Seal, sand, and wipe clean again.

Using the nose pattern as a guide, shape the nose out of *Fimo* clay. Bake according to manufacturer's directions.

Transfer details as needed.

PIG

Base the pig's head, ears, hands, and nose Peach Perfection using a wash brush. With the angular brush, float around the head, ears, nose, and hands with Peach Perfection + Cinnamon (1:1). Drybrush highlight the center of the head, ears, and hands with Skintone, using the scruffy. Transfer the face details.

Drybrush the cheeks, nose, tips of ears, and hands with Holiday Red using a circular motion. With a *Sakura* Identi-pen, outline the head, ears, and hands and go over the mouth and eyes. Glue the nose to the face with *Goop* adhesive glue.

HEART

Base the heart Holiday Red. Drybrush highlight the center of the heart with Wicker White. Outline the heart with the Identi-pen.

FINISHING

Spray all wood pieces with sealer. Finish with two coats of matte varnish. Let dry completely before moving on to the next step.

ASSEMBLY

Collar: Hot-glue half the doily to the inside front of the mitt and the other half over the outside front of the mitt. Glue the bottom front of the pig's head to inside the front of the mitt, over the doily. Glue the hands over the top edge of the mitt.

Thread black pearl cotton thru the buttons and knot. Hot-glue the buttons to the front of the collar.

Head scarf: Cut a strip of red plaid fabric 24" x 2³/4". Press under ³/4" on each long edge. Tie the strip around the head and knot on top of the head. Glue into place. Trim the ends into a "v". Hot-glue the ears over the head scarf.

Sign and patch: Bond two layers of ecru and white checked fabric together with HeatnBond adhesive, following the manufacturer's directions. Fuse HeatnBond to the back of the layered fabric. Cut out the sign. Transfer the words from the pattern packet and go over them with the Sakura Identi-pen. Fuse HeatnBond to the back of red plaid background fabric. Cut out this background 1/4" larger all around then the sign. Fuse the background to the oven mitt and fuse the sign to the background.

Fuse *HeatnBond* to the back of blue fabric. Cut the patch 1³/₄" square. Fuse the patch to the mitt over the edge of the sign. Using pearl cotton thread and a needle, stitch irregular stitches around the sign and the patch. Hot-glue the heart over the patch.

Fill with cooking utensils and start bakin'!



Apple Annie's Clogs



TO ORDER THE BLANK

To order the plain red clogs (#1000) contact DalaTrading Co., 300 Harrison St., Lindsborg, KS 67456. Call (877) CLOGS4U or visit www.dala-clogs.com.

PREP STEP

Try not to transfer the oils from your hands onto the leather. Also, do not seal the clogs; it's best if the paint can seep into the pores of the leather. Trace the pattern from the pattern packet onto tracing paper. Use graphite and the stylus to transfer just the apple to the left clog, then reverse the pattern and transfer the apple to the right clog.

Note: After the apple is painted, transfer the

flower placement. Then freehand the vines and leaves after the flowers have been added.

APPLES

Base the apples Crocus Yellow using the #10 filbert. Make a large float with Tomato Spice around the edges, painting over the yellow using the ³/₄" angular. Sideload and float again, but this time make the floated edge curve up and over the bottom to make the blossom end of the apple. Continue to float around and around, making sure not to cover the centers of the apples. Always keep your brush clean in the center. If needed, use the mop brush to get that highlighted yellow back. Shade the apples

with Candy Bar Brown. Paint the stem with Autumn Brown. Line a fine highlight on the apple with watered-down Light Chocolate using the 10/0 liner.

Cut out the apple from the tracing paper pattern. Position the cutout over the apple, being sure to cover the rest of the clog. Spatter just the apple lightly with Black, then water down the paint and line the apple and stem. Use a cotton swab to clean up, if necessary.

FLOWERS

Transfer the flower placement using the white graphite, or freehand them if you prefer. Doubleload the #6 filbert with Eggshell White and Crocus Yellow by dipping each side of the

brush with alternate colors, then blending them on your palette.

Place the tip of your brush at the tip of the petals, then pull to the center and lift off. It's o.k. to leave a little bit of the red coming through from the leather. Dab paint in the centers and shade with Candy Bar Brown. Spot paint the highlights with Eggshell White and Butter Yellow. Line around the flower with Black. Paint the tips of the petals with Delta Ceramcoat Sparkle Glaze.

LEAVES AND VINES

Water down some Light Foliage Green and Green Isle. Line in the vines with one shade of green, then overlap with the other shade of green. Put out some fresh paint and doubleload the #4 filbert. Add the leaves using the same technique as the flower petals. Place dip dots with Butter Yellow in groups of three along the vines and across the straps of the clog about 1" apart, using the stylus.

FINISHING

Seal with a spray coat or two of Fiebing's Leather Sheen. Let dry and enjoy!



Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to 1/8" Baltic birch plywood. Cut out all pieces using a scroll saw. Drill holes where indicated on the pattern. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Seal with wood sealer and sand lightly again; wipe clean. Transfer details as needed.

PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

Sun: Base the sun and face pieces with Custard. Using Butter Yellow and the filbert rake, stroke in ray lines on the sun piece and add bangs on the face. Drybrush Cornsilk Yellow on the tips of the sun piece to highlight.

Drybrush cheeks on the face with Gypsy Rose. Dot eyes and corners of mouth and line the smile with Black. Highlight the eyes with Seashell White. Line around the sun and the face piece with a brown *Micron* pen.

Bee: Base the bee head and body with Black. Add stripes on the body with Crocus Yellow. Base the wings with a semi-transparent coat of Seashell White. Float Old Parchment to define and separate the wings. Dot the bee's eye with Seashell White, then re-dot 3/4 of the eye with Black. Line the wings and the stripes with the brown *Micron* pen.

Spatter all pieces with Autumn Brown.

EASY ASSEMBLY

Glue the face to the sun piece. Glue the pin to the back of the sun. Cut gold wire in half and curl one end to make the antennae. Use a straight pin to make two small holes in the top of the bee's head, then glue the antennae into place. Attach black wire to the sun, curl and attach the other end to the bee. Finish the piece with a couple of coats of *Delta* Interior Matte Spray Varnish.



BLANK SURFACE

You can find a 100% cotton denim shirt at almost any discount or department store. Adapt the pattern to fit the size shirt.

PREP STEP

Wash and dry the shirt. Try to keep it wrinkle free. Place a board between the front and back sides. Squeeze enough Clorox Clean-Up Gel onto a Styrofoam plate to cover the bottom. Dip the cartouche stamp into the gel and place onto the shirt in random locations. Repeat with the butterfly stamp. Repeat with a cellulose sponge. Work on one side, let dry, place on a surface that won't be damaged by the bleach, and then work on the other side. Keep the board between the two sides throughout the drying

process. When color is as light as you'd like, re-wash and then dry again. Place the board back between the front and back sides.

Stencil large ferns in various locations

STENCILS

using the roller and Plaid Cactus Stencil Gel. Use only parts in some places such as the pocket or coming out from under the button hole placket. Stencil the tip of the small fern onto rectangles formed by the cellulose sponge and the Clorox gel, using the roller and Dark Sapphire Stencil Gel. Keep it neat by taping off the bottom of the rectangle where you want the stencil to stop. Repeat on the other side of shirt as before. Loosely outline large ferns with a Sakura Identi-Pen or a Plaid Tip Pen attached to the top of LicoPAINTING

Dip the #12 flat in FolkArt Textile Medium and doubleload with Italian Sage and Wicker

White. Paint One-Stroke ferns, overlapping other elements. Note: Each time you

dip in paint, add the textile medium.

Bees: Load the #12 flat with Yellow Ochre and paint the bee bodies. Load the liner with Licorice and textile medium and

add the head, antenna, and body stripes. Doubleload the #8 with Wicker White and Licorice and paint the wings. Outline the wings with Licorice.

Dragonfly: Doubleload the #12 flat with Wicker White and a small amount of Midnight and paint the dragonfly. Add a Licorice antenna.

Butterfly: Doubleload the #12 flat with Wicker White and Yellow Ochre and paint butterfly wings. Add the body and antenna with a liner and Licorice.

FINISHING

Dry for 24 hours and then set an iron to the highest heat setting the fabric can tolerate. Place a brown paper bag or a press cloth between the paint and the iron and hold the iron on the shirt for 30 seconds. Place on a hanger to cool off.

WOOD CUTTING & PREP

To cut the puzzle, transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet onto 3/4" pine. When transferring the pattern, make sure each piece is placed right next to the other so it can be cut as a puzzle. Cut with a scroll saw (there are four puzzle pieces, plus two small pieces). Cut a 91/2" piece of the 5/8" dowel. Drill a 5/8" hole through Goliath's hand and slightly into the spearhead. See pattern packet for building the book box. Sand with fine sandpaper and wipe clean. Seal with a wood sealer, sand again, and wipe clean. Transfer details as needed.

PAINTING TIPS

Paint each step in the order given.

Floating: Most of the shading and highlighting is done with just a hint of color to create a soft look. To soften a float on a small area such as the hands and toes, simply pat over the float with your finger. For areas that need more definition and separation, float several layers of color until it looks dark enough. An example of where a dark float would be needed is between Goliath and his armor bearer. Be sure to let the first floated layer dry before adding another.

PAINTING

Rock Background: With Cadet Grey, base the rock background on the following pieces: Saul's Armor, David with sling, and Goliath. Randomly drybrush the rock with Hippo Grey, then Charcoal, and then Lichen Grey. Spatter with Putty and then Black. Wipe off any extra splatters with a damp cotton swab.

SAUL'S ARMOR

Coat of Mail (Armor): Base the coat of mail with Brown Velvet. Using the #2 shader, paint the small metal scales with 14K Gold. Go back with the same brush and randomly paint over several of the scales with Bronze.

Sword: Base bottom area of the sword sheath with Charcoal, the white section

with Putty, the handle with Pewter, and the gold areas above and below the handle with Bronze.

Shade the Putty section with a hint of Autumn Brown. Shade the Charcoal area with Black on top and Pewter on bottom. Shade the handle with Charcoal and highlight with Putty. Shade the bronze sections of the handle with Brown Velvet. Line the handle and dot top of sword with Charcoal. With 14K Gold, line detail on the bronze areas, then add dots to the sheath and top of handle. Add smaller dots over all the previous dots with Putty.

Helmet: Base the helmet Bronze. Shade helmet, around helmet, and


above the sword with Brown Velvet. Repeat the shading around helmet and above sword with hint of Dark Burnt Umber. With 14K Gold, line detail on the helmet. Add a large dot to the helmet with Charcoal. Layer another dot over this with 14K Gold, then Putty. Shade

Rock: under the sword with Charcoal, and then repeat with a hint of Black.

Velvet. Randomly highlight several stones with Maple Sugar Tan, and the rest with Lichen Grey. Using Putty, go back and add a touch of highlight to several of the stones. Base the staff Autumn Brown. Shade with Dark Burnt Umber and line highlight with Maple Sugar Tan.

Skin: Base the skin Caucasian Flesh, drybrush highlight with Medium Flesh, and shade with Persimmon. Repeat shading with a hint of Autumn Brown. Repeat the shading on the clenched fist (between fingers) and left leg with a hint of Brown Velvet. Highlight the fingers, toes, and ear with Medium Flesh. Line eyebrow with Autumn Brown and dot the eye with Black.

Robe, Hair & Headband: Base robe Maple Sugar Tan and inside the



DAVID COLLECTING STONES

Grass: Base the grass area Forest Green. Line the grass with Light Timberline Green and then Sea Grass. Shade the bottom of the grass with Pine Green.

Stones & Staff: Base the stones Golden Brown. Line around each stone with Brown Velvet. To make the stones look more realistic, randomly shade some with Terra Cotta, Hippo Grey,

Autumn Brown, and Brown



Drybrush highlights on the robe with Putty. Shade robe with Golden Brown and inside the sleeve with Dark Burnt Umber. Base the belt Terra Cotta.

With Autumn Brown, shade the belt and repeat shading on the sleeves, under right sleeve to the knee, and bottom of robe. Line stripes on robe with Putty.

Base the hair Golden Brown, line with Maple Sugar Tan, and shade with Terra Cotta. Base the headband Brown Velvet. Line a few hair strands over the headband with Putty.

Wristbands, Bag & Sandals: Base the wristbands Autumn Brown. Base the bag and sandals Brown Velvet. Line the wristbands and shade the bottom of the bag with Dark Burnt Umber. With Autumn Brown, float little highlights on bag, along top of each sandal, and add flip-float highlights on soles. Shade the left sole on the sandal next to his knee with Dark Burnt Umber.

DAVID WITH SLING

Skin: Base the skin Caucasian Flesh, drybrush highlight with Medium Flesh, and shade with Persimmon. Repeat shading with a hint of Autumn Brown. Repeat shading under his chin and on his clenched fist (between fingers) with a hint of Brown Velvet. Highlight the fingers, toes, and ear with Medium Flesh. Line eyebrow with Autumn Brown and dot the eye with Black.

Robe, Hair & Headband: Base the robe Maple Sugar Tan and inside the sleeve with Brown Velvet. Drybrush highlights on robe with Putty. Shade the robe with Golden Brown and inside the sleeve with Dark Burnt Umber. Base the belt with Terra Cotta. Shade the belt and repeat shading on the sleeves, and the bottom of the robe with Autumn Brown. Line the stripes on the robe with Putty.

Base his hair Golden Brown, line with Maple Sugar Tan, and shade with Terra Cotta. Base the headband with Brown Velvet. Line a few hair strands over the headband with Putty.

Wristbands, Bag & Sandals: Base the wristbands Autumn Brown. Base the bag and sandals Brown Velvet. Line

the wristbands and shade the bottom of highlight on top and the bag with Dark front with Hippo Burnt Grey. Repeat highlight on the left side with a float of Cadet Grey, Pewter, and then of the spear with Black. Umber. With Helmets, Armor & Sword: Base the Autumn coat of mail (armor) Brown Velvet. Brown, float With the #2 shader, paint the small little highlights metal scales with 14K Gold. Go back on the bag, with the same brush and randomly along the top of paint over several of the scales each sandal, and with Bronze. Base the shoulder flip-float higharmor with Pewter. GOLIATH & ARMOR BEARER

Skin, Extra Hand, Mustache & Hair: Base the skin Caucasian Flesh, drybrush highlight with Medium with Flesh, and shade Persimmon. Repeat shading with a hint of Autumn Brown. Repeat shading between each set of toes, Goliath's hands (between fingers), and Goliath's left leg with a hint of Brown Velvet. Highlight the fingers and toes with Medium Flesh.

On both men, base the hair, mustache, and line the eyebrows and noses with Dark Burnt Umber. Dot the eyes with Black.

Spear: Wash the dowel with Brown Velvet. Base the spearhead Charcoal and drybrush

a hint of Putty. Shade down the middle

sheath Bronze, the handle Putty, and above and below the handle with Pewter. Shade the sheath with Brown Velvet and the handle with a hint of Autumn Brown. Base the diamonds on the sheath, line around the diamonds, and highlight the Pewter areas with Putty. Line the Pewter areas with Charcoal.

Skirts: Base the bottom of each skirt Red Iron Oxide and the top of each skirt with Candy Bar Brown. Shade the left side of Goliath, next to the armor bearer, from Goliath's skirt to the bottom of his sandal, and next to sheath with Brown Velvet. Repeat shading on under arm of armor bearer with Dark Burnt Umber and line and dot tassels with the same.

Shield & Dots: Base the center of the shield Pewter and dot with Bronze. Base the next ring Charcoal, the next Pewter, and the outer ring

over

with Bronze. With Charcoal, line the shield and add all dots to the sword, waist armor, shield, and each helmet. Dot Goliath's wrists, the center of the shield, around the shield, and add smaller dots to each of the other Charcoal dots on both men with 14K Gold.

Sandals: Base Goliath's sandals and line the leather straps over his legs with Dark Burnt Umber. Drybrush highlights on his sandals with Autumn Brown. Base the armor bearer's sandals with Brown Velvet and highlight with Autumn Brown.

Rock & Grass: With a hint of Charcoal, shade under the skirts and a few edges on the rock. With Forest Green, lightly drybrush some moss over the rock. Line grass with Forest Green, then Light Timberline Green, and then Sea Grass.

INSIDE THE BOX

Parchment Paper: Base the background behind the paper with Forest Green, and the paper with Maple Sugar Tan. Shade the paper sides, around the flipped corner, and across the top and bottom with Autumn Brown. Highlight the lighter sections of the bottom and sides with Maple Sugar Tan. Repeat shading on the darker sections of the bottom and sides with Brown Velvet. With Putty, highlight the top of the flipped corner, and drybrush highlight on the top right side and bottom left side of paper. Shade around all sides of the paper with Pine Green. Line rips and tears on the paper sitting on the scroll with Brown Velvet. Line rips and tears on paper below the scroll with Forest Green. Line the lettering with the Zig 2.0mm black calligraphy pen. Let the pen skip along somewhat to make the writing look old. Erase any graphite lines with a soft eraser. Some of the pen lines will fade with the eraser but it only adds to the antique look. Reline any letters that were completely erased.


Scroll: Base the large ends of the scroll with Autumn Brown, and the smaller ornate ends with Golden Brown. Drybrush highlights on the large ends and float highlights on the smaller ornate ends with Maple Sugar Tan. Shade the large ends and the smaller ornate ends with Brown Velvet, repeat shading with Dark Burnt Umber.

Sky: Wash the sky area with Blue Storm halfway down the piece, then drybrush over the washed area with Blue Heaven (leave some of the darker blue showing through). With Putty, lightly drybrush clouds in a circular motion,

then using White, stipple over the top area of the clouds. Base the top edge of the box and inside the sides of the box with Forest Green (this will cover any marks made by creating the sky).

Hills in Background: Wash dark hills in the background with Blue Storm. Drybrush Forest Green a bit over the hills. With Blue Storm, shade along both ridges and the bottom of the hill on the right side.

Rocky Hill: Base the rocky hill with Forest Green. With Light Timberline Green, highlight the ridge and then randomly drybrush grass between the rocks. Also drybrush over the bottom edge of the box. Base the rocks with a #4 shader and Lichen Grey. Shade the left side of each rock with a hint of Hippo Grey, and the right side with a hint of Putty. Lightly stipple rocks with Putty and then Black. Shade the grass here and there around the rocks with



Blue Storm. With a liner, add a few more highlights to the rocks with Putty. Line the blades of grass around the larger rocks with Pine Green, Light Timberline Green, and Sea Grass. Line the grass around the smaller rocks with Light Timberline Green and Sea Grass.


OUTSIDE BOX

Pages: Base the pages Lichen Grey. Shade next to the spine and across both sides of each corner with Brown Velvet. Line pages with Maple Sugar Tan, then Brown Velvet, and then Putty. Repeat shading next to the spine with Brown Velvet.


Front, Back & Spine: Base the front, back, and spine of book with Forest Green. Drybrush highlight down the spine, and flip-float the middle of each embossed stripe with Light Timberline Green.

Shade down each side of the spine,









above and below each embossed stripe, and across the corners of the cover with Pine Green. Using a #1 script liner, line the words on both the spine and front cover with Pine Green (use a liberal amount of paint on the brush and vary the pressure to create thick and thin lines). With Golden Brown, line scroll decoration on front cover (using same method) and on the top and bottom of each embossed stripe on the spine. Base the stones on the spine Golden Brown. Line around each stone with Brown Velvet. Randomly shade some with Terra Cotta, Hippo Grey, Autumn Brown, and Brown Velvet. Randomly highlight several stones with Maple Sugar Tan, and the rest with Lichen Grey. Go back and add a touch of highlight to several of the stones with Putty. Shade around the stones with Dark Burnt Umber.

EASY FINISH

Add sparkle glaze to the clouds, Goliath's shield, and armor. Spatter all pieces with Dark Burnt Umber including the box. To make David's sling (see pattern), cut a 15" piece of thin wire and twine. Twist together tightly. Fold in half. About 1/2" from the fold, twist the wire together forming a loop at the end. Then twist the ends together and trim. Cut a 5" piece of twine and wrap around the trimmed end to form the sling. Tie a knot at the ends and trim in back; hot-glue in place. Hot-glue sling to the back of David's hand.

To assemble Goliath's spear, slide the hand piece over the dowel about 2". Then hot-glue the spear head over the dowel. Cut a 10" piece of twine and wrap around the dowel between the spearhead and the hand. Tie ends together in back and trim; hot glue to

secure the twine. Also, hot-glue the hand to the bottom of the twine. Hotglue a small Velcro disk to the back of the hand on the spear and then to the end of Goliath's right arm (the spear can then be removed for storage). Apply 2-3 coats of varnish. Triumphant!

Sharon became an avid student of the creative process and took courses to understand the traditions and difficulties involved in the creation of their pottery. Sharon learned to "find the right type of clay,

how to grind it down, how to mix it, coil it and how to do the layering. We fired the pottery in the ancient way using manure and extracted colors from the earth, just as the Native Americans had." From practicing these ancient techniques and understanding the hardships they endured in everyday life, Sharon came to appreciate and respect the work of the Anasizi, known as "the Ancient Ones" of the four-corner states area.

Now before painting any Southwestern piece, Sharon hopes to honor the traditions of these ancient ones by giving a "true historical representation of an actual living piece or still life." She will visit a museum or exhibit and photograph various pieces of pottery. She will speak with archeologists and historians and will study a piece until she has an understanding of its significance to the creator and the process it took to become a functioning piece of art. Only then will she recreate the ancient pottery onto canvas, wood, or metal with the hope



of "conveying what those people who made the pottery felt."

Sharon has always been an artist, beginning with the time spent drawing while riding the bus 45 minutes to school in Salt Lake City, Utah. 
Sharon and her husband James own their own painting school, Shining Feather Art Academy in Sandy, Utah and she travel teaches and does workshops at conventions. She

PREP STEP

Seal the wood with *Delta* Artist Gesso and sand until smooth with 400-grit sandpaper. Wipe clean. Base the entire box with two coats of Black. Tape off the bottom edge of the lid with *Scotch* Magic Tape and apply 3-4 coats of Red Iron Oxide to the top edge. Let dry.

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet. Transfer details as needed.

PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

I mix 20 drops of *Delta* Color Float in 2 oz. of water and keep this in an empty paint bottle. When I want to blend or float something, I use this mixture on my brush instead of water.

CACTUS

Base the cactus with two coats of Putty, then apply two coats of Light Foliage Green. Shade-float shadow areas with Purple. Shadefloat Bahama Purple on the right edge of the cactus. This will create a "reflected" light.

Float highlight on the left side of the cactus with four coats of Lima Green. I like to float the color on, then soften the edges with the Smop brush, bringing the highlight color toward the center of the cactus. This creates a soft round look.

Cactus spines: Add the spines on the outside of the cactus with the 10/0 script liner. Paint the left side with Dark Goldenrod, then paint over this with Calypso Orange. Paint the right side Bahama Purple. The dots on the cactus are Georgia Clay. Stroke a few tiny lines coming out of the dots with Purple, then paint a few with a mixture of Bahama Purple and White (1:1).

CLAY POT

Base with two coats of Putty. Add three coats of Cornsilk Yellow. Add one coat of Light Ivory. Shade float the bottom of the pot and the area next to the sand with two coats of Purple. Float Orange over the Purple.

Paint inside the pot with Burnt Sienna, then float Orange over this. Paint the rim with Bahama Purple on the backside and Cornsilk Yellow on the front side. Re-apply the design on the pot using grey transfer paper. Paint the design Black.

CACTUS FLOWERS

Base with two coats of Red Iron Oxide. Paint over this with two coats of Royal Fuchsia. With the 10/0 liner, add Pretty Pink to the top areas where the light is hitting the petals. Add a few dots with Bahama Purple on the shadow area. Pull a tiny bit of Royal Fuchsia to the flower where it connects with the cactus. Blend this a little to create a dark shadow and to "ground" it to the cactus. These petals are done loosely with short strokes. Add dots of Calypso Orange to the centers.

GROUND AREA

Base with three coats of Brown Iron Oxide. Paint the "sunny" areas with two coats of Red Iron Oxide, blending into the shadow areas using a drybrush. Add one coat of Poppy Orange on the sunny side, using the blending mixture to soften into the shadow areas. Flip with Brown Iron Oxide. Add the last highlight with Calypso Orange, soften with the drybrush and the blending mixture. Float Purple into the shadow areas.

PURPLE FLOWERS

Stems: Base Alpine Green using the 10/0 liner. Add a few lines with Green Sea. Highlight with Village Green.

Purple flowers: Base Purple using the #4 drybrush. Tap in Purple and White (1: 1) for highlights, then Purple and White

(1:3) for more highlights. Add a touch of Royal Purple. Leave the cluster behind the pot without highlights. Add just a bit of Bahama Purple to this color for the reflected light.

FINISHING

Varnish with at least three coats of Delta Ceramcoat Interior Spray Varnish or Exterior/Interior Varnish. Let dry completely.

PUZZLE CONSTRUCTION

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to 11½" x 7½" x ½" Baltic birch plywood for the back piece and 11½" x 7½" x ¾" alder for the top. Any splinter-free wood can be used as long as it is safe for a child. When laying out the wood, make sure the grain on the top piece runs vertically.

Measure in 3/4" from the top and bottom of the top piece and 7/8" from the sides, then draw lines to form a frame.

Drill a hole in the waste wood (the part that will be between the crayon tips), insert the scroll saw blade, and cut out the frame from the main piece. Set aside.

Transfer the crayon pattern to the cut piece, repeating the pattern all the way across the board. Separate the crayons by cutting in between each with your scroll saw. Now go back and cut the tops following the shape on the pattern.

Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Seal and let dry completely.

PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

Paint the back piece and the frame Ebony Black, using a wash brush.

Crayons: Base the crayons using one of the palette colors for each, using the 3/4" flat. Do not use Black or Glorious Gold.

Apply the oval patterns to each crayon and paint them Ebony Black with an angular brush. Apply the rest of the detail patterns. Using Glorious Gold, add stripes with the ultra round and comma strokes on the ovals with the liner.

Shading: The crayons can be left as is or can be shaded. Add a tad of Ebony Black to Primary Red, Burnt Umber (brown), Sapphire Blue, Titanium Snow White, and Forest Green and then shade down both sides, below and above the stripe labels, and above the line on the tip of those colored crayons.

On the Yellow and Orange crayons, use Burnt Umber + the base color. The Spice Pink crayon is shaded with Primary Red + Spice Pink.

Highlight each one on the tip of the crayon as shown on the pattern. Add details lines with a C-thru ruler and a black *Sharpie*.

Optional painting: As an additional educational aid, I painted the names of each crayon using the actual color. Mark off each crayon section with a ruler, and paint the appropriate color name in the space.

FINISHING

Allow the pieces to dry for several hours. Sand with a crumpled brown paper bag and seal with three coats of *DecoArt* Satin Varnish. Let dry between each coat.

ASSEMBLY

Glue the front frame piece to the back piece and clamp down or set a couple of heavy books on top. Check for any excess glue that may have oozed out and wipe it away with a damp cloth before it dries. Allow the glue to dry completely. Remove the clamps and insert the crayon pieces.

HOLDER

You will need a table saw for this project. I used a 3" x 3" x 7" piece of pine, but you can use any size you want. Pattern can be adjusted accordingly. Drill holes as needed to accommodate the

Photo shows large crayons. Once you have decided how big you want to make this holder, drill a small hole in the center for spindle handle (available at most craft stores). Then drill as many holes as needed for your size crayons. Attach the handle with wood glue. Sand; wipe clean. No need to seal.

PAINTING CRAYON HOLDER

Paint the entire piece Black. Apply main pattern lines with white graphite and ruler. Make necessary adjustments. Use painter's tape to mask off areas for ease of painting. Paint each crayon a different palette color. Do not use Oyster Pearl or Glorious Gold. When dry, apply balance of pattern with the exception of the center oval and black area on labels. Go over label only with very light, thin wash of Oyster Pearl. Do not go over top and bottom of crayon.

Paint stripes on top and bottom of label in Glorious Gold using the chisel blender. When dry, apply oval pattern. Base oval

> and black areas on stripes in Ebony Black.

SHADING

the Use base color of each crayon and then add the following for shading: Pink + Red. Yellow OF Orange Burnt Umber. For all other color crayons just add a touch of Black to the base color. If you are good at reverse floating, apply a reverse float down the center of each crayon with







PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to ³/₄" pine for the sign. Cut out using a scroll saw. The pine stake is 1¹/₄" x 21" x ⁵/₈". Sand with 200-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Base both the sign and the stake with a wash of Spice Brown. Let dry completely. Transfer the pattern to the sign with graphite paper.

BORDER

Paint the squiggly border with thinned Spice Brown. Add alternating squares with Burnt Umber. Outline the border and squares with Black. Add the lettering with Black.

VEGGIES

Base the tomato with Tomato Spice, shade with Burnt Umber, and drybrush highlight with Pumpkin. Base the tomato leaves and peas English Yew Green, highlight with Crocus Yellow, and shade with Black Green.

Base the carrots Georgia Clay and highlight with Pumpkin. Shade the carrots with equal parts Tomato Spice and Burnt Umber. Stipple the carrot greens with English Yew Green. Stipple here and there on the greens with Black Green, highlight with stipples of Crocus Yellow. Outline all the veggies with thinned Black.

BUNNIES

Base the bunnies Ivory, shade with Spice Tan. Deepen shading in some areas with Spice Brown. Drybrush cheeks and the insides of the ears with Fiesta Pink. Base the noses with Fiesta Pink, shade with Tomato Spice. Add facial details with thinned Black. Outline the bunnies with Burnt Umber.

FINISH

Using an old toothbrush, spatter the sign with Black. Apply several coats of varnish with a soft brush. Attach the stake to the back of the sign with wood glue.





PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to ¼" Baltic birch plywood. Cut out using a scroll saw. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper and wipe clean with a tack cloth. Seal, then lightly sand and wipe clean again. Transfer main pattern outlines and details as needed.

FACE, HANDS, EARS & FEET

Base the face, hands, ears, and feet Golden Brown. While paint is still wet, stipple with Light Ivory, keeping it lightest in the center of the face and the outside edges of the hands and feet. Water down Spice Brown and stroke on the stripes. Shade with Spice Brown. Add squiggly lines to the outside edges with Light Ivory.

Eyes: Base the eyes Leprechaun. The pupils are Black. Shade the eyes next to the pupils with Pine Green, highlight the outside edges with Village Green. Outline the eyes and add eyelashes with Black.

Face: Float and line the cheeks with Fruit Punch. Add highlight dots to the eyes and cheeks with Light Ivory. Base the nose Coral, shade the bottom and outline with Barn Red. Highlight with Light Ivory and add a comma stroke across the top of the nose.

Base the mouth Coral and shade it with Barn Red. The lip is Golden Brown, highlight with Light Ivory. Add a Light Ivory comma stroke across the top of the lip. Line whiskers and fur lines between the nose and mouth with Light Ivory. Float inside the ears with Coral. Shade the ears above the hat brim with Spice Brown.

HAT

Base the hat Straw. While the paint is still wet, slip-slap with Light Ivory. Shade with Raw Sienna, then shade again in the darkest areas with Spice Brown. Highlight with Light Ivory.

The hatband is Leprechaun, shade with Pine Green, and highlight with Village Green. The stripes are Pine Green, line the center of the stripes with Village Green.

HANDKERCHIEF

Base with Leprechaun, shade with Pine Green, and highlight with Village Green. The fish on the border are Tangerine, loosely outline with Calypso Orange. Dot their eyes with Light Ivory, then again with smaller dots of Black. The stripe above the fish and the dots on the rest of the handkerchief are Village Green.

SHIRT

Base Light Ivory. The stripes, stitching, and buttons are Leprechaun. Float a circle inside the button with Village Green. The holes and the line connecting the holes on the buttons are Black. Line the outside of the buttons with Pine Green. Shade the shirt with Spice Brown.

BELT

Base with Raw Sienna, shade with Dark Chocolate, and highlight with Light Ivory. The buckle is Black, highlight with Dolphin Grey. The clasp is also Dolphin Grey, outline with Black. The holes are lined with Dark Chocolate.

PANTS & STRAW

Pants: Base the pants Denim Blue. While the paint is still wet, lightly brush over the center of each leg with Blue Mist. Highlight the zipper flap and between the legs with Blue Mist. Shade the pants with Midnight. The cuffs are Blue Mist. Water down Denim Blue and very lightly crosshatch the cuffs. Highlight with Light Ivory.

Straw: Base with Straw, shade with Raw Sienna, and highlight with Light Ivory.

BIRD SEED CAN

Base with Light Ivory. The top edge is Leprechaun. Stencil the checks across the bottom of the can with Tangerine. "Fluffy's" lettering is Leprechaun, then line with touches of Black and Calypso Orange. "Bird Bait" is Leprechaun, then add touches of Black. Line "Food" and "2 oz." and also cross out "Bait" with Black.

SIGN

Base with Pine Green. Apply Weathered Wood and allow to dry completely. Paint over this with Light Ivory. Base all the lettering with Leprechaun and then outline the left side of the letters with Pine Green. "Bird Food" is then lined again next to the green with Tangerine. Line over the Tangerine, here and there with Calypso Orange. The stick is washed with Spice Brown.



FINISH & ASSEMBLY

Apply two to three coats of satin varnish. Let dry completely. Using 24-gauge Icy Kiwi and Popsicle Orange Fun Wire, insert through the hole in the bird seed can, then through the hole in the bottom of the kitty's hand, and then through the other side of the can. Twist at the bottom. Curl the ends of the wire coming through the holes in the can. Make a bow using both colors and attach under the hand.

Glue and nail the sign to the stick. Then glue and nail the stick to his hand. Glue and nail a stake to the back of the kitty's body.

PREP STEP

Sand, seal, and lightly re-sand holder only (not the insert). Base the holder Khaki Tan and then shade the side pieces and the top of the back piece with Burnt Umber. For the insert, mix equal parts of Warm White and DecoArt Clear Gel Stain. With a soft rag, apply an even coat of this mixture to the insert. Let it dry thoroughly (preferably overnight) before applying the main pattern outlines (banner and oval). Next, base the insert background (outside the banner and oval sections) with Antique White and then stencil with Khaki Tan using the 1/4" checkerboard stencil. Lightly sponge over the checked area with Antique White to soften the contrast. Then shade around the outside edges of the oval and banner as well as the top, bottom, and side edges of the insert with Burnt Umber. Base the border around the oval with Khaki Tan.

PRELIMINARIES

Before adding the main pattern lines to the oval, lightly draw in the location of the ground line. Add water to Winter Blue to make a thin wash and then wash the upper area of the oval. Shade around the edges of this (sky) area with full-strength Winter Blue. Shade around the top and bottom edges of the ground area with Khaki Tan. Add the pattern lines. Use full-strength Winter Blue to add some shading behind the fence. Using Light Avocado, add some shading beneath the pumpkins and apples. Also, with the chisel edge of a 3/8" angular brush, lightly float some green on the rest of the ground area using Light Avocado.

DETAILS

Fence: Base Dove Grey, shade with Driftwood, and highlight with Warm White. Dot the nail heads Slate Grey.

Coveralls: Base with Uniform Blue. Using the 1/4" deerfoot brush, drybrush with Winter Blue, first in one direction and then in the opposite direction. Shade with Deep Midnight Blue and highlight with Winter Blue. The buttons

are dots of Marigold, shaded with Raw Sienna.

Face, Feet, and Hands: Base Toffee and shade with Sable Brown. Drybrush the cheeks Cadmium Red. The eyes and mouth are Lamp Black. Dot highlights in the eyes using Warm White. The nose is Country Red shaded with Antique Maroon.

Hat: Base Raw Sienna, shade with Burnt Umber, and highlight with Honey Brown.

Shirt: Base Light Avocado. Thin Marigold with water and paint the plaid lines using a liner. Shade with Evergreen.

Scarf: Base with Reindeer Moss Green. The dots are Country Red made with the end of a toothpick or stylus. Shade the scarf with Light Avocado and highlight with Warm White.

Straw (Hair, hands, feet): Use slightly thinned Raw Sienna, Honey Brown, and Marigold to paint the wisps of straw using a liner brush.

Pumpkins: Base Bright Orange and shade with Burnt Sienna. Drybrush Marigold on the center area of each of the pumpkin sections to highlight. The pumpkin stems are Raw Sienna shaded with Burnt Umber.

Apples: Base Country Red, shade with Antique Maroon, and highlight with Cadmium Red. The leaves are Light Avocado shaded with Evergreen.

Bird: Base Graphite, shade with Lamp Black, and highlight with Slate Grey. The eyes are Warm White with Lamp Black dots (pupils). Base the beak and feet Marigold and shade with Raw Sienna.

Banner: Shade the banner with Khaki Tan. Slightly thin Light Avocado and paint the lettering using the #3 round brush. Dot the letter ends with full-strength Light Avocado. Base the sunflower leaves Reindeer Moss Green and shade with Light Avocado. The petals are Marigold shaded around the outside edge of the flower center with Raw Sienna. The flower center is Raw Sienna shaded with Burnt Umber. Thin Burnt Umber and paint the crosshatched lines. Add dots around the edge of the flower centers starting with Burnt Umber, then Raw Sienna, and finally Marigold.

FINISHING

Using the technical pens, add all the outlining, stitching, and detail lines to the design. I use the finer tip for the face area and the larger tip for all the

rest. In some areas, I added a second outline for emphasis. Don't forget to use the pens to add detail lines on the stems of the pumpkins, on the petals of the sunflowers, and extra wisps of straw on the hair, hands, and feet. (Once you have completed the inking, you may want to lightly spray the insert with matte finish to seal it before the spattering step). Thin Lamp Black slightly with water and spatter the insert as well as the main rack. Spray both the rack and insert with several thin coats of matte finish to complete.



WOOD BLANK

You can use the birdhouse of your choice found at local craft or hobby stores. Adapt the pattern to the shape of your birdhouse.

PREP STEP

Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Base the front and sides of birdhouse with Tapioca. Base the roof, ledge, and base with Engine Red. Let dry. Apply crackle medium to roof, ledge, and base area. Follow instructions for crackle dry time. When dry, brush Bayberry over the crackle. Be sure to avoid restroking crackled areas.

The tip of the perch is Bayberry. When dry, spray crackled area with a matte sealer. Transfer details as needed.

STEMS

Doubleload your #12 flat with Hunter Green and Sunflower. Using the chisel edge, create the base stems fanning left and right. Add push-turn-lift leaves to stems. I took these stems from the left of the hole on to the left side of the birdhouse and up and over the roof.

SWEET PEAS

Using the #12 flat doubleloaded with Berry Wine and Wicker White create several overlapping shell strokes to create both buds and full flowers. Using the same brush with Thicket and Sunflower, add a calyx by making several push-and-lift strokes going down toward a stem created with the chisel edge of the brush.

DAISIES

Base the center area of the flower with Wicker White. Next, using a filbert loaded in Wicker White, press and turn strokes toward the center of the flower. Start with the long strokes on either side and then fill in. Using the small scruffy doubleloaded in Maple Syrup and Schoolbus Yellow, pounce a center with brown to the base. Add Licorice dots around the center for accent. Add Gold Sparkle paint to dried center, if desired.

GREENERY

Using the #12 flat loaded with Hunter Green and Wicker White, make dab greenery with the white upward. Start at the tip and add random strokes from side to side down to the base. Apply with slight pressure.

RIPPLE LEAVES

Using the angle brush with Thicket on the heel and Sunflower on the toe, place the toe at the center of the leaf and ripple downward to create a leaf. Reverse the stroke for the opposite side. Always let the toe follow to make a nice tip.

LEAVES

Doubleload the #12 flat or either the #8 or #10 filbert brush with Thicket and Bayberry. Create push turn lift leaves as desired. Outline delicately in Licorice if desired.

Filler leaves: These leaves are made by doubleloading various colors from the palette onto the smaller filbert brush and making push-turn-lift leaves where desired. You can also wiggle as you make this stroke. Outline delicately in Licorice if desired.

DAB FLOWERS

Using the small scruffy, doubleload with Wicker White and Dioxazine Purple. Pounce on a foam plate or palette to blend. Add dab flowers where desired by touching this brush to the surface with a slight push. Add some green stems.

GRASS

Fan brush grass: Use your liner to pull a stem in Maple Syrup, and then load your fan brush in inky Thicket or Hunter Green and pull the grass heads away from the top of the stem.

Grass: Using the chisel edge of the flat or angle brush and various green mixes, push, drag, and lift to chisel to form tall grass.

Using your liner or fan brush, use mixed greens to pull grasses over the finished design around the base.

DOTS

Add brush handle dots in Pure Gold and Wicker White where desired.

FINISH

Spray with a matte sealer. Wipe with a wash of water and Maple Syrup to antique if desired. Spray again with matte sealer.

PREP STEP

Transfer outline patterns to 3/4" pine. Seal with *Delta Ceramcoat* All-Purpose Sealer. Sand with 400-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Apply one coat of *Delta* Antiquing Gel Brown to the back of the girl/watering can piece and the base-board. Let dry; apply basic pattern lines.

FENCE

Base Lichen Grey. Shade-float with Territorial Beige and repeat with Dark Burnt Umber. Highlight-float with Raw Linen and repeat with Light Ivory. Using Dark Burnt Umber, repeat the shade float, make crack lines and knot holes in boards, and add a nail.

LEAVES & FLOWERS

Paint the leaves before the flowers. Base the leaves Medium Foliage Green. Shade-float with Pine Green, highlightfloat with Leaf Green, then repeat with Lima Green.

Base the far left flower on the fence Coral, shade-float with Fruit Punch, repeat with Tuscany Red, and highlight-float with Western Sunset Yellow. Base the top flower Grape. Shade-float with Eggplant, highlight-float with Lilac Dust and repeat with Lilac, Base the front bottom flower Antique Gold. Shade-float with Mocha Brown, highlight-float with Butter Yellow, and repeat with Sunbright Yellow. Outline all petals with Cornsilk Yellow.

Next add the flower centers. Base all the centers Mocha Brown. Highlightfloat with Golden Brown. Shade-float with Dark Chocolate. Add dots of Black along the bottom edge and make a highlight dot with Cornsilk Yellow.

GIRL

Face and hands: Base Medium Flesh, shade-float with Desert Sun Orange, and highlight-float with Fleshtone. Using the fabric round brush and Persimmon, drybrush rosy cheeks. Use this color to shade-float the bottom edge of her nose.

Using thinned Burnt Sienna and the 10/0 liner, outline the eyes lightly. Base the iris with Burnt Sienna and the pupil with Dark Chocolate. Place a tiny highlight dot at the top edge of the pupil and a tiny highlight stroke on the bottom edge of the iris with Light Ivory. Lightly make eyelashes and eyebrows and line the mouth using the 10/0 liner and Burnt Umber. Place highlight dots of Light Ivory on the nose and cheeks.

Hair: Base Autumn Brown. Shadefloat with Dark Chocolate and highlight-float with Golden Brown.

Dress: Base Coral, make stripes with Fruit Punch, and add wavy trim lines with Ivory. Shade-float with Tuscany Red. Repeat very lightly with a dark red mix; Black Cherry + Payne's Grey (2:1). Highlight-float with Western Sunset Yellow. The buttons are dots of Ivory with tiny dots of Black for the holes.

Apron: Base Forest Green, shadefloat with Pine Green, and highlightfloat with Leaf Green. Add stitch lines with Light Ivory.

Shoe: Base Autumn Brown, shadefloat with Dark Chocolate, highlight-float with Mocha Brown, and repeat with Golden Brown. Make eyelets with dots of Black and add laces with Light Ivory. Outline eyelets and place a highlight comma stroke on the toe with Light Ivory. Base the sole Dark Burnt Umber and highlight overstroke with Autumn Brown.

Hat: Base Antique Gold, shade-float with Mocha Brown, and repeat with Burnt Sienna. Highlight-float and drybrush with Butter Yellow, then repeat with Sunbright Yellow. Make highlight crosshatch lines with Cornsilk Yellow. Base the hatband with Prussian Blue, highlight-float with Copen Blue, and repeat with Chambray Blue. Make trim lines with Light Ivory.

Add leaves as before. Base the flower Grape, shade-float with Eggplant, high-light float with Lilac Dust, and repeat with Lilac. Outline the petals with Cornsilk Yellow; add the center as before.

WATERING CAN

Base Bridgeport Grey. Shade-float with Copen Blue, repeat with Nightfall Blue, then repeat in the deepest areas lightly with Prussian Blue. Highlightfloat with Chambray Blue, repeat with Glacier Blue. Base alternating squares in checkerboard band with Grape and Light Ivory. Make a trim band of Prussian Blue at the top and bottom edges of the checkerboard band and also on one handle. Float Black for the hole in the other handle, then outline it with Glacier Blue.

BASEBOARD

Shade-float next to the flower pattern lines with Burnt Umber. Paint all ribbons the same as the hatband. Add the leaves as before.

Front motif: Base the right and left end flowers Antique Gold. Shade-float with Mocha Brown, highlight-float with Butter Yellow and repeat with Sunbright Yellow. Base the back center flower Grape, shade-float with Eggplant, highlight float with Lilac Dust, and repeat with Lilac. Base the front center flower with Coral, shade-float with Fruit Punch and repeat with Tuscany Red. Highlight-float with Western Sunset Yellow.

Outline all the petals on these flowers with Cornsilk Yellow and add the centers as before.

Back motif: Base the flower Grape. Shade-float with Eggplant, highlight-float with Lilac Dust, and repeat with Lilac. Outline the petals with Cornsilk Yellow and paint the flower center Mocha

Brown, highlight-float with Golden Brown, and shade-float with Dark Chocolate. Add dots of Black along the bottom edge and make a highlight dot with Cornsilk Yellow.

EASY FINISH

Glue, then screw the top girl/watering can piece to the baseboard. Varnish with three coats of *Delta Ceramcoat* Interior Varnish or Interior Spray Varnish. Let dry. Add the clock piece to the watering can.

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to 3/4" wood. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Mix wood sealer with Plantation Pine (1:1) and paint the front of the watering can (not the sides), and the sides and top edges of the planter box. Let dry, then apply *DecoArt* Weathered Wood Crackling Medium in a slip-slap manner here and there on both pieces. Do not add the medium to the center area of the watering can. Let dry.

Again in a slip-slap manner, paint the entire front area with Buttermilk. It should not be smooth looking. Let dry, then wash with Celery. Transfer details as needed.

LEAVES AND GRASS

Using the #12 shader, doubleload the brush with Plantation Pine and Light Avocado. Pull the leaves from the bottom up, twisting the brush up on the chisel edge as you go up to create the points. Shade with Midnight Green. Pull grass up with Plantation Pine, Midnight Green, and Light Avocado.

TULIPS

Base the tulips with Gooseberry Pink. When painting tulips, I do one tulip petal at a time, starting with the back, center petal, then the left petal, and then the right one. You may want to practice before painting the project.

With the #4 round, scoop up a "glob" of

Buttermilk and "glob" it across the top of the flower petal. While the paint is still wet, take a filbert brush and lay it just below the Buttermilk glob. Push the brush up into the Buttermilk and then pull down following the contour of the petal. If you stay up on the tip of the brush and use kind of a flicking/pulling motion, you should end up with a lacy edge, veins, and highlights coming down the petal. Do not pull all the way to the bottom of the petal. If you need more veins, use the liner brush and Buttermilk. Shade the petals with Cranberry Wine. The stems are Midnight Green. Drybrush highlight where needed with Light Avocado.

SIGN

Base the sign Celery. Shade around the inside edges with Plantation Pine. Shade around the outside and outline with Midnight Green. Line with Gooseberry Pink. Line here and there along the Gooseberry Pink line with Cranberry Wine. Drybrush highlight through the center with Buttermilk. The letters are Gooseberry Pink, shade across the bottom of each with Cranberry Wine. Line to the left side of the letters with Cranberry Wine. Drybrush a highlight shine in the center with Buttermilk.

FINISHING

Wash the edge of the watering can with Gooseberry Pink. Shade along the front edge with Cranberry Wine. Glaze here and there on the front with Cranberry Wine. The back of the watering can is slip-slapped with Buttermilk and Celery. The inside of the planter box is Plantation Pine.

Finish with at least two coats of matte varnish. Let dry. Apply two strips of Velcro to the



back of the watering can and then to the front of the planter box.

Attaching the front piece this way allows you to change the front of the box according to the season. Keep an eye out for the upcoming seasonal designs!





The oil and vinegar glass bottles can be found at your local retail store. These particular bottles were found at a flea market.

PREP STEP

Sand off any stickers or glue, then wash and dry the bottles thoroughly. Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet. Transfer details as needed.

CARROTS

Doubleload the #12 flat with Pure Orange and Sunflower. With Pure Orange on the outer edge, paint one side of the carrot, then turn the brush around and paint the other half. Refer to the worksheet for instructions.

Load the #2 script liner with inky Burnt Umber. Add the details and roots. Doubleload the #12 flat with Thicket and Fresh Foliage. On the chisel edge, leading with Fresh Foliage, paint some stems pulling from the center of the carrot.

Doubleload the #6 flat with bake at 350° for Thicket and Fresh Foliage. Turn off oven Starting at the tip of the carrot to cool inside.

top, paint small strokes to form the foliage on the carrot top.

RADISHES

Load the #12 flat with Engine Red. Paint the upper part of the radish. Sideload a touch of Burnt Umber and shade one side of the radish. Load the #12 flat with Wicker White and paint the bottom part. Refer to the worksheet.

Load the #2 script liner with inky Wicker White and add details and roots to the top part of the radish. With the #2 script liner and inky Burnt Umber, add details and roots to the bottom part.

Doubleload the #12 flat with Thicket, Fresh Foliage and a touch of Wicker White on the Fresh Foliage side. With the Fresh Foliage to the outer edge, paint leaves on top of the radish.

SCALLIONS

Doubleload the #12 flat with Wicker White and a touch of Fresh Foliage. Paint the bottom part of the scallion. Using the same brush, pick up Thicket and more Fresh Foliage. On the chisel edge, touch, lean slight, and pull strokes to form the top part of the scallion.

Load the #2 script liner with inky Burnt Umber to add the roots on the bottom of the scallions.

EASY FINISH

Allow the paint to cure for 48 to 72 hours, then bake at 350° for 30 mins. Turn off oven and allow to cool inside.





PREP STEP

Transfer the outline pattern from the pattern packet to 1/8" Baltic birch plywood. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper; wipe clean. Transfer details as needed.

Refer to the pattern for dotting and "x"-ing, which indicates exact areas of shading and highlighting.

SKY

Using the #8 flat, base the sky Indian Turquoise. Shade along the horizontal line with Violet Haze using the #10 chisel blender.

SUN

Using the #8 flat, base the sun Moon Yellow. Shade with Marigold using the #10 chisel blender. Shade again in the same area with the same brush using just a touch of Blush Flesh.

MOUNTAIN RANGE

Base the mountains Gingerbread using the #8 flat. Shade using the #10 chisel blender and Delane's Deep Shadow. Highlight the mountains with a touch of Shade Flesh. On the left side of each peak, highlight with just a touch of Indian Turquoise.

CACTUS

Using the #8 flat and a spotter brush, base the cactus Hauser Medium Green. With the #8 and #10 chisel blenders, shade the cactus with Hauser Dark Green and highlight with Olive Green.

CACTUS FLOWER

Base the flowers Pineapple using the spotter brush. With the #6 chisel blender, shade the throat of the flowers first with Olive Green, and then again with Marigold. Shade the outer edge of the flower with Marigold and shade again with just a touch of Blush Flesh.

SAND

Base the sand with the #8 flat and shade with the #8 chisel blender using Sable Brown.

PAINTBRUSH PLANT

Using the spotter brush, base all the brush handles Charcoal. With the #6 chisel blender, shade the brush handles with Lamp Black. Using the same brush highlight the brush handles where indicated.

Base the bristles of the brushes with Lamp Black using the 8/0 round. With the same brush, thin Light Parchment and add individual hairs onto each brush. Referring to the picture, paint onto some of the brushes using the following colors: Country Red, Desert Turquoise, and Marigold. With a stylus, dip-dot the ferrules on the brushes with Shimmering Silver.

BANNER

With the spotter brush, base the banner Light Parchment. Shade with Marigold using the #8 chisel blender.

EASY FINISH

Finish all pen work as indicated on the pattern. Using a straight edge ruler, draw the border around the pin, except for the parts where the cactus, brushes, and banner extend out past the border. Using the spotter brush, base the border around the pin with Lamp Black. Spray with DecoArt Matte Spray Varnish. Glue the pin to the back.
