

SHADING

Use the 1/2" angular shader to shade the kitty and her paws, the birdhouse, and the sign with Autumn Brown. Shade the roof and heart with Black.

Use the 1/4" angular shader to float a highlight of Ovster White along the top of the kitty's nose, along the left side of each eye, and the bottom of her paws. Blush the kitty's cheeks with an old scruffy brush and Delta Garnet Red Stencil Creme.

DETAILS

Use the #0 liner to paint squiggly lines around the sign with thinned

Use a stylus to dot the letters with Black and the top and bottom of the kitty's eyes and cheeks with Oyster White.

Use an old toothbrush or a spatter brush to lightly spatter all pieces, avoiding the kitty's face, first with thinned Oyster White, then Black.

EASY FINISH

Wood-glue the kitty's paws and the sign to the birdhouse and the heart to the sign. Hot-glue Spanish moss in the birdhouse hole.

Cut a 1/4" wooden dowel, 101/2" long. Glue a 2" x 2" x 1/4" piece of plywood to cover the hole in the bottom of the terra cotta pot. Hot-glue a 4" styrofoam ball into the pot. Secure the tray to the top rim of the pot with tacky glue.

Wood-glue the birdhouse to the dowel. Squirt hot glue in the hole on the top of the tray, and while the hot glue is still warm, stick the dowel in the hole.

Apply Delta Satin Exterior Varnish. Tacky-glue a 23" strip of fabric around the rim of the pot. Cut another piece of 23" fabric, tie into a bow, and glue to front rim of pot on the fabric band.

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns of the cat with birdhouse from the pattern packet to 3/4" pine. Transfer the sign and heart to 1/4" birch plywood. Cut out all pieces with a scroll saw. Drill holes as indicated on the pattern packet.

Sand each piece with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Stain all wood pieces with Delta Antique Oak Wood Stain or the stain of your choice. While still wet, wipe the stain with a lint-free rag. Allow stain to dry for one hour. Sand lightly to remove burrs. Transfer the main pattern outlines. Transfer the details as needed.

Wash the terra-cotta pot and tray with warm water. While the tray is still damp, drill a 1/4" hole in the center. Leaving the tray somewhat damp will help soften the clay to prevent breakage.

BASECOAT

Use the 34" wash to base the pot and tray Cinnamon, Base the birdhouse Trail Tan and the roof Cinnamon.

Use the #10 flat to base the kitty and her paws Golden Brown. Base the sign Butter Cream and the heart Cinnamon. Use the #0 liner to paint stripes on the

kitty and paws Raw Sienna. Base her nose, mouth, whiskers, and eves Black. The lettering on the sign is also Black.

Use the 1/2" stencil brush and the 1/2" checkerboard stencil to apply Cinnamon checks to the birdhouse.

10 Wood Strokes & Woodcrafts

TO ORDER A WOOD BLANK

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. Cut the bunny, her arm, the bird, the sign, the base, and the birdhouse from 3/4" pine. Cut the bunny's nose, the three hearts, the watermelon slice, and the birdhouse roof from 1/4" birch plywood. Drill holes as indicated on the pattern.

Sand first with 150-grit, then 220-grit sandpaper, and dust off with a clean dry cloth. Transfer main pattern outlines Transfer details as needed.

BASECOAT & SHADING

Base the bunny's face, ears, hands, legs, the center of the sign, and the birdhouse Sand. Base the wooden hearts, the bunny's wooden nose, her hatband and bow, and the slice of watermelon Deep Burgundy.

Base the bunny's apron, hat, and the bird's beak Mississippi Mud. Base the bunny's dress Deep Midnight Blue and her shoes Lamp (Ebony) Black. Base the bird and the outside edge of the sign Honey Brown. Base the watermelon rind. the birdhouse roof and perch, and the base Antique Teal

Shade the bunny with Mississippi Mud and her dress with Payne's Grey. Shade her apron and hat with Raw Umber. Shade the wooden hearts, the bunny's wooden nose, her hatband and bow, and the watermelon with Black Plum. Shade the bird and the outside edges of the sign with Milk Chocolate. Shade the watermelon rind and base with Black Green. Highlight the bunny's shoes, hat, and watermelon with Sand.

DETAILS

Use the #6 shader to paint the wide stripes on the bunny's dress with Payne's Grey. Reinforce the color where the stripes cross.

Use the 3/8" checkerboard stencil to stencil Lamp (Ebony) Black checks on the front of the birdhouse

Use the #10-0 liner to add the thin stripes on the bunny's dress Deep Burgundy. The thin stripes on her hatband, bow, and the wooden hearts are Black Plum. The lettering on the sign is Deep Midnight Blue; the stitching and outlining are Lamp (Ebony) Black.

Use the liner to base the bird's eye and to outline the watermelon rind Sand. Let dry. Base the bunny's eyes and mouth and the watermelon seeds Lamp (Ebony) Black. Dot the center of the bird's eye with Lamp (Ebony) Black.

Use a very dry brush to blush the bunny's cheeks with Deep Burgundy.

EASY FINISH & ASSEMBLY

Lightly sand all edges of the wood pieces with 220-grit sandpaper to give them a worn look

Antique using your favorite antiquing medium. Use a spatter brush or old toothbrush to spatter all pieces, first with Sand, and then Lamp (Ebony) Black.

Wood-glue the perch and roof to the birdhouse, the watermelon to the sign, and the hearts to the bunny's apron.

To make the whiskers for the bunny . cut and curl six piece of 3" long wire, and hot-glue to the nose. Secure the nose to the bunny with wood glue

Cut one piece of wire 12" long, and attach to the sign. Twist the ends together, and hot-glue to the bunny's head.

Tie a raffia bow around the wire at the base of the hand. Hot-glue the Spanish moss to the birdhouse and to the bunny's arm. Attach the bird to the arm.

Secure one eve screw to the top of the birdhouse and one to the bunny's hand. Attach the birdhouse to the hand with jute. Cut two pieces of jute 10" long, thread through the holes in the shoes,

Push two upholstery tacks into the apron. Wood-glue the arm to the bunny. Using the 5/16" dowel, glue and dowel the bunny to the base. Spray with clear acrylic spray, and let dry,

TO ORDER A WOOD BLANK

To order a wood blank for Honey Bee. Candle Holder (item #MM-02), contact Country Elf, 57544 Hwy. 221, Story City, Iowa 50248; or call (800) 325-6122.

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns to the appropriate wood. Cut the bear and the base from ¾" pine. Cut six bees, the bee hive, and the bear's arms from ¼" baltic birch plywood.

Drill tiny holes in the shoulders, tops of arms, bees, and the stand. Refer to the pattern packet for placement.

Slightly round the edges of all pieces, using a belt or hand sander. Sand smooth with 100 then 220-grit sandpaper, and dust off. Transfer main pattern outlines. Transfer details later as needed. Note: After basecoating each piece, let day and sand lightly.

HONEY BEAR

Base the bear's face, hands, and feet Sable Brown. Base his shirt, sleeves, and the edge of the base Camel. Base his overalls French Grey Blue and the cuffs Lt. French Blue.

Base the muzzle and the inner ear Mink Tan. Blush the cheeks with Delane's cheek color.

Dot the eyes, paint the nose, mouth and eyebrows with Lamp (Ebony) Black Let dry. Shade the face, ears, hands, and feet with Burnt Umber.

Stencil "wools" design on shirt and sleeves with Honey Brown. Shade the shirt and sleeves with Honey Brown.

Line and shade the overalls with Uniform Blue. Shade the cuffs with French Grey Blue and highlight with Buttermilk.

BEES, BEEHIVE, & STAND

Base the beehive Honey Brown and the bee bodies True Ochre. Base the top of the stand and the bee wings Butternilk.

Base the bee heads Lamp (Ebony)
Black. Shade and line the beehive with

Milk Chocolate. Add a few lines of Camel for highlights. The beehive door is Lamp (Ebony) Black.

Shade the bee bodies with Honey Brown. Use a #2 flat to paint Lamp (Ebony) Black stripes on their bodies. Dot the bee eyes with Butternilk. Use a #,005 Sakura Pigma Micron permanent black pen to add the stitches on the wings.

Let all pieces dry completely and sand the edges lightly.

ANTIQUING INSTRUCTIONS

You can use your own favorite antiquing medium, or try Myra's Paste. Wax method: Mix ½ cup wax with ¼ teaspoon each Burnt Umber and Burnt Sienna oil paint. Apply mixture with a sponge brush to all pieces. Wipe dry with a clean cloth: Let dry for 15 minutes and buff with a clean, dry cloth.

Deepen antiquing around edges with a cloth dipped in Burnt Umber oil paint. Wipe nearly dry on paper towel. Rub gently around edges to darken. Use a clean cloth to blend into lighter areas.

a clean cloth to olend into lighter areas.

Use a spatter brush or an old toothbrush to spatter first with Light Buttermilk, then with Lamp (Ebony) Black. Avoid spattering the bear's face.

ASSEMBLY

Glue the bee hive to the bear and attach the bear's arms to his body with 19-gauge wire.

Tie a bow from blue plaid scrap fabric and glue to the bear. Attach the bear to the stand with glue and a 3/4" drywall screw.

Cut twelve pieces of 19-gauge wire, 16" long. Bend and glue in place to make bee antenna. Cut various lengths of 19-gauge wire. Curlicue wire, attachbees, and glue wire into holes in stand.

Place a tin tray on the stand behind the bear, add a beeswax candle, and let the candle light warm up your evening!

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. Cut Nikki, the bird flowers, and the base from ¾" pine. The base is 4¾" x 10". Cut the pocket, sign, and sock cuffs from 1½" birch plywood. Cut the hat, arms, and fence rails from ¼" birch plywood.

Use a '14" dowel for the sign, fence, birdhouse, the bird flowers, and the pegs to secure the bird flowers to the base. The fence dowels are 3½" long. The sign dowel is 6½" long. The birdhouse dowel is 9" long. The four pegs to attach the bird flowers to the base are ½" long. Cut two pieces of ½" dowel for the perches.

Sand smooth with 150-grit sandpaper, and dust off. Apply *Delta* Waterbased Wood Sealer, sand again lightly, and dust off with a tack cloth. Transfer main pattern outlines. Transfer details as needed.

SPECIAL NOTE:

The base colors for this project are washes that are one part paint to one part water. (Denise adds *Delta* Color Float to the water used for the washes. Simply add a few drops of float to each 2 oz. of water.) Shading and highlighting are applied with full-strength paint.

WASH, SHADE, HIGHLIGHT

Wash Nikki's face and hands with Medium Resh, shade with Dark Flesh, and highlight with Fleshtone. Dry-brush her cheeks with Gypsy Rose. Use the stylus to dot her eyes Black. Use the .01 Sakura Micron Pigma black pen to line her mouth.

Wash her overalls with Cinnamon, shade with Cinnamon. Wash her shirt and pocket with Silver Pine. Wash the stripes for the plaids on her shirt and pocket with Woodland Night, shade with Woodland Night and highlight with Silver Pine + White (1.3). Add the thin lines on either side of the wide stripes in Cinnamon with the '96 liner brush.

Wash her socks and collar with Bambi; shade with Brown Velvet and highlight with Fleshtone. Wash her shoes with Black Green; shade with Black Green. Wash the hat with Antique Gold; highlight with Vory.

Use the stylus or the end of a brush to dot the buttons on Nikki's shirt Cinnamon and the buttons on her overalls Woodland Night.

WATERING CAN & SEED PACKET

Wash the watering can with Lichen Grey; shade with Hammered Iron and highlight with Sandstone. Base the heart on the watering can Cinnamon and the seed packet AC Flesh. Base the space behind the watering can handle Black. The lettering on the seed packet is done with the #03 Sakura Micron Pigma black pen. Dot the ends of the letters with the end of a small brush or a stylus and Black.

BIRD FLOWERS

Wash leaves and pegs with Woodland Night; shade with Black Green, and highlight with Jade Green. Use the 1% liner to line the veins with Black Green.

Wash the birds with Cape Cod; shade with Nightfall. Base the beaks with Antique Gold and dot the eyes with Black. Dry-brush the cheeks with Gyosy Rose.

THE SIGN & BIRDHOUSE

Wash the sign with Cinnamon. Base the checks with Woodland Night.

Wash the birdhouse with Antique White. Let dry. Wash the brick area with Georgia Clay; shade with Red Iron Oxide. Base the roof and holes Charcoal.

FENCE, DOWELS, & BASE

Stain the fence, the dowels, and the base with *Delta* Fruitwood Stain. Let dry completely. Stipple the top of the base with Woodland Night and Jade Green.

EASY FINISH & ASSEMBLY

All remaining linework is done with the .01 Sakura Micron Pigma black pen.

Drill holes as indicated on the pattem. Drill 14" holes 3%" deep in the top of the base for the fence, sign, and birdhouse posts and for the plant pegs. Also drill the same size holes in the bottom of the flowers for the pegs. The location of the holes in the base is personal preference.

Wood-glue the arms, hat, pocket, and sock cuffs on Nikki.

Glue the sign and birdhouse on the dowels; glue the dowels in the base. Glue the plant pegs in the bottom of the flowers; glue the pegs in the base. Glue the fence posts to the base, then glue the rails to the posts. Finish with three to five coats of *Kirlon* spray.

Glue small pieces of hair to the top of Nikki's forehead for bangs. Glue feathers to the top of the birds' heads. Wrap the grapevine around the fence, signpost, and birdhouse post. Soaking vines first will make them more pliable. Glue the gardening button and shovel to the fence.



ORDERING INSTRUCTIONS

To order a wooden Gardening Watering Can item #CE005 for this project, send \$32.95 + \$5.50 s&h to: The Cutting Edge, P.O. Box 3000-402, Chino, CA 91708 or call (909) 464-0440

To order the canvas checkbook cover from Creations in Canvas item #ckCV for this project, contacy: The Dalee Book Co., 129 Clinton Place, Yonkers, N.Y. 10701

To order the angel plant stake, contact: The Wizards of Wood, 5250 Bonsai Ave., Moorpark, CA 93021, or call (805) 523-3181 or (800) 237-6578 (orders only please).

All the projects are painted from the same paint palette. To mix the paint use a metal bubble palette. Fill the paint 1/2 full in a bubble, add three or four drops of water, one drop of color float, and mix.

WATERING CAN PREP STEP

Base the entire can Dk. Burnt Umber. Make a copy of the pattern from the pattern packet and cut 1/8" from the edges of the main pattern lines. Center the cut-out design copy onto the watering can. Use a pencil to trace along the cut-out line.

Follow the manufacturer's instructions to apply the crackle medium to the entire can up to the traced line. Do not apply crackle medium to the inside of the traced line. Let dry completely. Base Magnolia White to the entire can, including inside the traced pattern area. Base the handle and the spout Dk. Night Blue.

Re-center the pattern design to the watering can and tape at the top to secure. Slip a piece of transfer paper behind the pattern (graphite side towards the watering can surface) and transfer the pattern.

CAUTION: be sure the crackle medium has cured completely before transferring pattern or the tape will lift the crackle from the watering can.

BRUSHES

Base with the #10 and #6 shaders and the #5 round, using the size that best fits the area. Shade and highlight using the #10 and #6 shaders and the 1/4" angular shader. Use the #0 liner to add the detail lines and the lettering. Use a small stencil brush or an old scruffy brush for dry brushing and stippling.

PAINTING THE ANGEL

Base the angel's face and hands Wild Rice with Lt. Chocolate added to it: shade Burnt Umber. Base her eyes Black and her nose Burnt Umber.

Base her wings Lichen Grey; shade Burnt Umber. Base her hair Dk. Burnt Umber. Use the stylus to add Black dots around her hair.

Base her dress Sachet Pink with Burnt Umber added to it. Base her sleeves Sachet Pink and her collar Magnolia White.

Base her button cheeks and the glove on her dress Lichen Grey. Base the heart on the glove Dk. Night Blue.

Paint the plaid on her dress Sonoma Wine. Outline the plaid with thin lines of Dk. Burnt Umber.

PAINTING THE BEAR

Base the bear Spice Brown, His eyes, nose, antenna, belly button are Black. Base his heart cheeks Sachet Pink and his wings Ivory with Cloudberry Tan

PAINTING THE BEEHIVE

Base the beehive Golden Brown with strokes of Burnt Umber added. Base the top of the beehive Burnt Umber. Base the star Cinnamon with a drop of Dk. Burnt Umber. Base the star hole Lichen Grey with a drop of Dk. Night Blue. Base the perch Black.

PAINTING THE BIRDHOUSE

Base the birdhouse Blue Wisp, the roof Dk. Burnt Umber, and the wood sign Mudstone. Base the heart on the sign and the bottom plaid Rainforest Green. Base the perch and the sign nail dots Black. Base the hole Lichen Grey with a drop of Dk. Night Blue.

PAINTING THE WATERING CAN Base the watering can Lichen Grey

and the spout, top, handle and stripes Dk. Night Blue.

Base the inside of the can Lichen Grey with a drop of Dk. Night Blue.

Alternate the checks at the top of the can Cinnamon with a drop of Dk. Burnt

Base the star Antique Gold and add Black dots to the spout.

Umber and Magnolia White.







PAINTING THE FLOWERS

Base the flower petals Crocus Yellow: shade with Antique Gold. Base the flower centers Burnt Umber with Dk. Burnt Umber stripes and Black dots. Base the leaves Deep River Green.

PAINTING THE CHECKERBOARD

Alternate the checks Williamsburg Blue and Magnolia White. Shade the Williamsburg Blue checks with Dk. Night Blue

LINEWORK

Use the Koh-I-Noor Rapidiograph pens and Rapidiograph Ultra-draw 3085-F ink to add the linework. Use the .30 point for main lines, the .25 for detail lines and small outside lines, and the .18 for dots and filler lines. Refer to the pattern for placement.

WATERING CAN EASY FINISH

Lightly sand piece. Apply ordinary makeup blush to cheeks with a cotton swab. Spray several coats of matte finish. Woodglue handle and spout to watering can.

PLANT STAKE

Transfer the outline pattern of the angel plant stake from the pattern packet to 3/4" pine, her collar to 1/8" birch plywood, and the three gloves to 1/4" bass wood. Cut out all pieces using a scroll saw. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper and wipe clean. Tape the wing pattern from the pattern packet to the piece of tin and cut out the pattern with scissors. Paint the angel as instructed on the watering can with two exceptions: delete the water and the color float.

PLANT STAKE EASY FINISH

Rust the metal pieces as shown in the rust recipe on page 21. Allow adequate time to rust. Nail the wings to the back of the angel. Tacky-glue the collar piece to the back of the doily. Trim the doily along the neck and shoulder edge 1/8" from the edge. Tacky-glue the raw edge to the back. Hot-glue the collar in place. Attach the a button to the collar using 24-gauge wire. Fashion hair using the Mocha colored Mohair and twine into bows. Hot- glue in place. Wire the metal heart buttons to the gloves with 24-gauge wire. The gloves are then wired to the angel's hand using 22gauge wire. Stain the dowel using Delta Oak Gel Stain and glue in place









T-SHIRT

Transfer the outline pattern of the angel plant stake from the pattern packet to 34° pine and the three gloves to ¼° bass wood. Cut out all pieces using a scroll saw. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper and wipe clean.

CHECKBOOK COVER

Transfer the design to the pre-shrunk muslin. Peint as directed for the watering can, with several exceptions. Delete the color float and one drop of control medium to the paint. Wash your fabric before applying paint. Always practice on a scrap pice of muslin first to be sure that the color does not bleed. If it does bleed, you will need to add more control medium, very sparingly. Heat-set the color by covering the painting with a clean cotton cloth and ironing, using a low setting.

Ink the lines as directed for the watering can. Apply ordinary make-up blush to cheeks using a cotton swab. Stitch the muslin to the shirt using two strands of DWC #893. Use a running, quilting stitch. Washing instructions are very important Hand wash with Woolite in cold water. No exceptions!

RUST RECIPE

1/4 cup white vinegar 1/8 tsp. salt

Mix vinegar and salt until salt dissolves. Lay the metal pieces onto a paper towel. Absorb the liquid with another paper towel and wring out lightly. Lay the damp paper towel over the metal pieces and the pieces will begin to rust in no time. Flip pieces over and apply the damp towel to the other side.



ona Gobel's career as a designer has been a journey of self-discovery.

Through her art, Nona has intuitively brought forth a natural talent for painting and design that she never invisioned when she beagan her journey. Her art is a reflection of herself, she says, and her artistic institutes have guided her well.

Lond before Noire Became a painter, her first love was dolls. She has a unique collection of hand crafted doll of the heart of the hear

Dolls, of course, require ministure quilts for their well-being, and injuddition to doll clothes, None's early creative efforts centered on patchweek and appliqued quilts, which she embellished with wood cyli-outs. When she approached a quilting problem of the course of the course

Nona soon purchased a scroll saw to cut-out her own small wooden embellishments-like the ones on her quitts-so they could be submitted to the painting publishers. She just picked up a brush and began painting the small wooden cut-outs to suit her fancy. It worked!



PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. Cut one %" dowel 6" long. Cut the back board and shelf base from ¾" pine. Cut the main piece, the bunny's arm and hand, the flower, and bird from ¼* Baltic Birch plywood. Cut the sail and the sun from ¼" baltic birch plywood.

Sand all pieces with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Seal with your favorite wood sealer, and sand again. Transfer the main pattern outline. Transfer the details as needed.

BRUSHES

Base with the 34" flat wash, the #10 shader, and the #8 round, using the size that best fits the area. All shading is done with the 34" flat and the #10 shader. The details are done with the #196 script liner and the #9 round liner.

BASECOAT & SHADING

Base the back board, the sail, the inner tube patch, and the bunny with two coats of Lt. Buttermilk. Base the bird and the water Country Blue and the shelf Sand.

Base the sun, the flower, and the bird's beak Moon Yellow. Base the inner tube and the mast Graphite. Base the sailor hat and glass frames Sapphire. Base the lenses with Lamp (Ebony) Black.

FAUX FINISH

The back board has a faux finish. Crumple a 15" long piece of Saran Wapa Male a 9" puddle of water on the palette and add enough Country Blue to that the water. Using the 34" wesh, quickly cover the entire back board. Now, using the crumpled saran wapa, pat all over the piece continually until the effect is very soft. You will go over the same areas many times. Keep turning the same wrap to keep it fairly day. Let this dry thoroughly. To create the sand on the shelf, spatter the entire piece first with Grey Sky, then Khaki Tan, then Mississispip Mud and finally LB. Butternilk (in that cofficial Tan).

SHADING

Shade the rainbow on the sail in the following order: Lavender, Country Blue, Hauser Lt. Green, Moon Yellow, Pumpkin, and Boysenberry Pink. Shade around the circle of the sun, the petals of the flower, and the top of the birds beak with Antique Gold. Shade the bunny with Grey Sky.

Use a fluffy #6 flat brush, pick up a small amount of Boysenberry Pink and

wipe nearly dry on a towel. Dry-brush the cheeks on the sun, using a circular motion.

Make a 1.1 mix of Boysenberry Pink and Lt. Buttermilk and base the bunny's nose. With this same mix, dry-brush his cheeks, as on the sun. Shade the top of his nose with Boysenberry Pink. Shade the hat at the temples and across the crown with True Blue. Shade the bird's wings and the top of the water with Sapphire. Shade the center of the inner tube with Lamp (Bborn) Black.

Use the 3/6" comb and thinned Lt. Buttermik to lightly stroke the highlight around the inner tube, make sure to curve it slightly to follow the shape of the tube. Stroke the center again for brighter highlights. Fill in the meat of the watermelon with a wash of Boysenberry Pink and shade with full-strength Boysenberry Pink. Line the rind with Hauser Lt. Green.

Shade the outside edge of the back board with a wide float of Sapphire.

DETAILS

To finish the bunny's face, outline his smile and make tiny hearts at the end with a mix of Boysenbery Pink and a drop of Graphite. Make tiny lines in the lenses and the stitching on the hat with Lt. Buttermilk.

Dot the watermelon seeds, outline the letters on the sign, line the sun's mouth and eyebrows, and dot the sun's and the bird's eyes with lamp (Ebony) Black. Dot the letters with the end of a large brush and Lamp (Ebony) Black. Use the 005 Sakura Pigma Micron permanent black per to outline the circle of the sun, the bird's beak, the colors of the rainbow, the left side of the letters, the flower petals, and the watermelon patch.

EASY FINISH & ASSEMBLY

Sand all the edges of everything except the shelf, back board, and mast. Apply the white caps on the water with DecoArt Snow Tex and a tiny brush or palette knife. Sorew the shelf to the back board with the wood screws.

Glue the mast and separate hand to the bunny. Cut a piece of 19-gauge wire 2º long and run it through the bunny's arm. Glue one end into the flower with E-6000 glue. At this point, paint the wire with Hauser Lt. Green. Glue the arm in place on the bunny and glue a brown button in the center of the flower. Attach the sail to the mast with three pieces of black DMC floss? long. Place a touch of glue at the center of each bow to secure. Now glue the main piece and sail to the back boyet.

Glue the bird to the top of the mast and the sun to the upper right. Hot-glue the shells to the shelf. Spray the entire piece with Krylon Matte Spray Vamish. This piece can hang to welcome your guests at the door way or sit on a bookshelf to remind you of the lazy days of summer.

PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. The large bunny is cut from 3/4" pine. The small bunnies and the sign are cut from 1/2" pine. The small bunnie's arms are cut from 1/4" birch plywood, and the bow tie is cut from 1/8"

Sand each piece with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Transfer the main pattern outline. Transfer the details as needed.

BRUSHES

Use the #6 and #10 shaders for basecoating large areas and the #5 round to base smaller areas. Use the size that best fits the area. Use the 1/4" angular shader for shading and highlighting Use the #0 liner for lining and adding small details. Use the stylus or the end of a small brush to add dots.

BASECOAT

Base all three bunnies Raw Sienna and the sign and sign post Antique White. Base the large bunny's pants Antique

Teal and his jacket Colonial Green. Base the large bunny's hat Camel, his bow tie and hatband Tangerine, and all

the bunnies' shoes Lamp (Ebony) Black. Base the shirt on the left bunny Burnt

Orange and the dress on the other bunny Antique Gold. Add Antique Gold dots on the shirt and thin double Burnt Orange stripes to make the plaid on the dress.

THE PLAID & STRIPES

Add thick stripes to create the plaid on the lacket with a wash of Antique Teal

Add the double linework to the large bunny's jacket with Crimson Tide. Add the single Burnt Orange lines to the hatband and bow tie. The stitching on the large bunny's pants is Buttermillk.

SHADING & HIGHLIGHTING

Shade all three bunnies with Russet. Shade the large bunny's pants with Lamp (Ebony) Black and the jacket with Antique Teal. Shade the hat and around the sign with Raw Sienna

Highlight the noses, shoes, hat, hatband, and bowtie with Buttermilk. Highlight the the large bunny's pants with a dry-brush of Buttermilk.

DETAILS

Base all the eyes, noses, and the bunny with the oval mouth Lamp (Ebony) Black. Add Buttermilk highlight dots to the eyes with the stylus. Base the heart on the sign Crimson Tide. The lettering on the sign is Lamp (Ebony) Black.

All the remaining linework, including the mouth and evebrows is done with a #.01 Sakura Micron Pigma black permanent pen.

EASY FINISH

Use an old toothbrush to lightly spatter all pieces first with Lamp (Ebony) Black, then with Buttermilk. Wood-glue the bow tie on the large bunny, the small bunnies to the back of the large bunny, then the arms to the back of the small bunnies. Wood-glue one end of the dowel into the sign and the other end into the bunny's hand. Finish with several coats of Delta Satin Finish. Place next to your favorite house plant or attach to a garden stake for your garden.



PREP STEP

Transfer the outline pattern to the appropriate wood pieces. Cut Hannah from 3/4" pine. Cut the four flowers, the four hearts, and the wings from 1/4" plywood. Drill holes through the flowers and Hannah's left hand as indicated on the pattern packet.

Sand each piece with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Transfer the main pattern outline. Transfer the details as needed.

BRUSHES

Use the #6 and #10 shaders for basecoating large areas and the #3 round for small areas. Use the 1/4" angular for shading and highlighting. Use the #1 liner for linework. Use an old scruffy brush to dry-brush cheeks and a stylus to add tiny dots.

BASECOATING

Base Hannah's face, hands, and feet Medium Flesh and her hair Raw Sienna. Her eyes are Lamp (Ebony) Black with Buttermilk highlight dots. Dry-brush her cheeks Napa Red. Base her dress Williamsburg Blue and her collar and wings Antique White.

Base Hannah's apron Khaki Tan. Base the middle birdhouse on her apron Napa Red and the other two Evergreen. All three roofs and posts are Light Cinnamon with Lamp (Ebony) Black holes

Base the birds Salem Blue with Antique Gold beaks. Dot the eyes Lamp (Ebony) Black with Buttermilk highlight dots.

Base the two flowers on Hannah's apron Antique Gold with Raw Sienna centers and Evergreen stems.

Base the four wooden hearts Napa Red. Base one wooden flower Colonial Green, one Napa Red, and the remaining two Antique Gold.

SHADING & HIGHLIGHTING

Shade Hannah's face, hands, and feet with Red Iron Oxide. Shade her hair collar wings, and apron with Russet Shade the birds' beaks the flowers, and their centers with Russet.

Shade Hannah's dress and the birds with Deep Midnight Blue. Shade the birdhouses, their roofs and posts, and the flower stems with Lamp (Ebony) Black.

Highlight Hannah's face, hands, feet, and dress with Buttermilk. Highlight her hair with Antique Gold and her apron with Antique White.

Highlight the birdhouses and their roofs, posts, and holes with Buttermilk. Highlight the birds, the flowers, and the flower centers with Buttermilk.

DETAILS

Add the double line work on Hannah's dress Colonial Green and on her collar and wings Williamsburg Blue The double linework on the four wooden hearts and all the flowers is Buttermilk. Add detail lines to Hannah's hair with Russet.

All stitching and remaining linework is done with a #01 Sakura Pigma Micron black permanent pen.

EASY FINISH

Sand all edges lightly with 150-grit sandpaper. Wood-glue three hearts to the bottom of Hannah's dress and one to her collar. Glue wings to her back and buttons to the flowers.

Cut a 12" length of 19-gauge black wire, insert one end through Hannah's hand, and curl in front to secure.

Attach flowers to other end, curling in between each flower. Curlique end to secure. Attach a sawtooth hanger to the back for hanging. Finish with several coats of Americana Matte Sealer/Finish.





PREP STEP

Transfer the outline pattern of the pixie from the pattern packet to 34" pine. Transfer the watering can to 14" birch plywood. Cut out both pieces using a scroll saw. Drill holes as indicated on the pattern packet.

Sand each piece with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Base each piece with your favorite wood sealer. Transfer the main pattern outlines. Transfer the details as needed.

BASECOAT

Use the #10 flat shader to base the pixie's dress Lavender and her hair Pineapple. Base her wings and the watering can Light Buttermilk.

Use the #6 flat shader to base the pixie's face, hands, and feet Fleshtone. Let dry, sand smooth, and repeat all basecoats again.

DRESS PLAID

Use the #6 flat shader and Dioxazine Purple that has been thinned with water to paint the wide stripes of the plaid on the pixie's dress.

Use the #10-0 liner and thinned Light Buttermilk to apply the thin double lines of the plaid.

Use the #10-0 liner and thinned Dioxazine Purple to apply the thin lines between the thick purple and thin double white lines. Refer to pattern and photo.

DETAILS

Use the #2 flat shader and Hauser Dark Green to apply the stripe on the watering can. Let dry and repeat.

To dry-brush, apply a small amount of paint to an old scruffy flat brush and wipe off excess paint on to a paper towel until the brush is almost dry.

Blush the pixie's cheeks with a drybrush of Cranberry Wine. Apply in a circular motion.

Use the #10-0 liner brush to base the leaves on the watering can and

the pixie's hair Hauser Dark Green.

Use the #2 flat shader and Lavender to base the large flower in her hair. Repeat when dry, if needed. Use the #10-0 liner first to add darker Dioxazine Purple petals to the flower, then Light Buttermilk for lighter petals to the flower center.

Use the #10-0 liner with Hauser Dark Green that has been thinned with water to add the wavy vine lines to the pixie's hair and the watering can. Next add thinned Lamp (Ebony) Black for a second bunch of wavy lines to

Use the stylus to add the tiny dot flowers by making a tiny dot and lightly pulling it towards the center of each flower. The flowers in the poke's heir are Dioxazine Purple and the flowers on the watering can are Levender. Use It. Butternilk to dot the baby's breath and the center of the flowers in her hair.

Use the stylus or the end of the liner brush to add Lamp (Ebony) Black dots for the pixie's eyes and to dot the lettering on the sign.

SHADING

Use the #6 flat to shade the pixie's face, hands, and feet with Caraberry Wine. Shade her wings with Lavender and the edges of hair with Golden Straw. Shade her right arm and under her left arm with a float of Lamp (Ebony) Black. Shade the watering can with Hauser Dark Green.

EASY FINISH

Use a spatter brush or an old toothbrush to spatter both pieces with thinned Lamp (Ebony) Black.

All the linework is done with thinned Lamp (Ebony) Black and the #10-0 liner. After lining the pixie's eye, dot with the stylus and Lamp (Ebony) Black.

Spray both pieces with matte varnish, let dry completely, and attach the sawtooth hanger to the back. Cut a length approximately 3* long of 19gauge copper wire and insert one end into the hole in her hand and the other end through the hole in the watering can handle. Twist in back to secure. This little pike will stand watch over your garden to ensure that it will flourish. For her companion Garden Fairy, see page 66 in the March '98 issue.





PREP STEP

You may find it easier to paint all pieces before assembly. Refer to the exploded perspective illustration on the pattern packet for assembly Transfer the outline pattern for the side

(The three canisters that sit in this holder are in issues #24, #25, and #26. These issues can be ordered on page

68.) Sand all pieces with 400-grit sandpaper. Wipe clean. Varnish with Delta Waterbased Varnish, sand again, and wipe clean

Basecoat entire surface with an equal mixture of Sandstone and Light Ivory. Base the routered edges and the backs of all pieces (except the two inside pieces that hold the canisters) Dolphin. Varnish entire piece one coat to protect the wash. Transfer main pattern outlines on the two side panels. Transfer details as needed.

SIDE PANELS BASECOAT

Base the shrubs and tree Silver Pine; shade with Blue Spruce. Base the tree trunk and limbs with an equal mix of Sandstone and Trail; shade with Autumn Brown.

Shade the fence and gate with an equal mixture of Sandstone and Trail Base the birdhouse Rose Cloud;

shade with Rose Mist. Base the birdhouse door Dolphin;

shade Williamsburg Blue. Base the birdhouse roof and base

Williamsburg Blue Base the chimney Western Sunset; shade with Autumn Brown.

The hole and the perch are Blueberry done with the double-ended stylus.

EASY FINISH

All lining, stitching, the door handle, and hinges are Charcoal. All dots are made using marker. Let dry overnight to allow marker to set. Assemble according to the exploded perspective illustration on the pattern packet

Finish with several coats of Delta Waterbased Varnish, allowing adequate drying time between coats. Place the canisters in the holder and set on your counter to be admired by all. The letter holder in the next issue of Wood Strokes & Woodcrafts will complete this charming series.

ORDERING INFORMATION

To order a blank birdhouse for this project, send \$15.00 + \$4 s&h to Brian Hill Studio 8694 Bath Road, Byron, MI 48418- or call (810) 966-4958.

PREP STEP

This design can easily be adapted to any size or shape birdhouse. To build your own birdhouse, refer to the exploded perspective illustration in the pattern packet for dimensions and assembly information.

Sand with 150-grit sandpaper, and wine clean with a damp paper towel.

BASECOAT

Use the 1" wash to base the birdhouse Butter Cream. Use the #10 shader to base the roof, perch, and the base Boston Fern.

Use Loew-Cornell Easy Graphite Transfer Paper to transfer the pattern from the pattern packet to the front of the birdhouse.

Load the #6 shader with Golden Brown and the tip with Cinnamon, Pull brush back and forth on a practice surface to blend the colors, keeping more of the Golden Brown on the brush. Repeat this step if necessary. You may want to try a practice square before painting on the birdhouse. Base each of the squares keeping the Golden Brown to the left.

APPLES

Use the #10 shader to base the left side of each apple. For the remainder of the apple, repeat the technique used on the squares. Load the brush with Barn Red and Candy Bar Brown, keeping the Candy Bar Brown to the right edge of the appole. Paint inward and blend into the Barn Red.

LEAVES

Load the #4 shader with Boston Fern and base the leaf, leaving about a quarter of the space free at the tip. Tip the comer of the #4 shader in Leaf Green and paint along the top edge and downward blending into the Boston Fern. This technique for highlighting works well for beginners Repeat for each leaf.

Doubleload the #10/0 liner with Candy Bar Brown and Butter Cream and paint the stems. Let dry completely. Add the lettering with the liner and Black.

FINISH

Lightly sand the edges of the birdhouse and perch for a slightly worn look.

Apply Delta Warm Brown Antique Gel to the birdhouse using a sponge brush. Keep a clean dry sponge handy to wipe away any excess gel whenever necessary.

Use the speckling brush or an old toothbrush to spatter with Candy Bar Brown. Finish with several coats of Delta Exterior Varnish. Wood-glue the perch into the hole.



Use an old scruffy brush to dry-brush the crows' bodies with White.

Thin Burnt Umber with water and use for antiquing the signs. When dry, use a spatter brush or an old toothbrush to spatter the signs with Burnt Umber.

Wood-glue the feet to the crows. Seal the crows and signs with Delta Exterior Varnish.

Use an old rag to wipe Patina Green on copper faucet and let sit until copper turns green. You might have to repeat



PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. The girl with beehive and base are cut from 34" pine. The bees, heart, and hands are cut from 1/4" pine.

Sand the rough edges with 150-grit sand the rough edges with 150-grit sacks and sides of the grif with beehive and the base with Minwax Provincial Stain. The remaining pieces are painted on all sides.

Transfer the main pattern outline.

Transfer the details as needed.

BASECOAT

Base the girl's face and hands Mink Tan. Base the beehive and base Honey Brown and the heart Cranborry Wine. Base the bee wings Buttermilk and alternate the stripes on the bees with Lamp (Ebony) Black and True Ochre. Base the girl's collar Black Forest Green.

STENCILING

Use the 1/8" stencil brush to stencil a 1" checkerboard across the beehive and beehive base with Antique White. Dry-brush Rookwood Red cheeks on the girl.

DETAILS

Use the stylus or the end of a brush to dot the girl's eyes with Lamp (Ebony) Black.

SPATTERING

Use a spatter brush or an old toothbrush to spatter the beehive and base with Lamp (Ebony) Black.

EASY FINISH

Sand around edges of all wood pieces. Antique the painted surfaces, using your favorite stain. Barbara uses Delta Home Decor Liquid Wood Stain (Antique Oak). Simply apply stain to painted surfaces with a brush or rag, and wine clean. Let dry thoroughly.

Use Koh-I-Noor® .50 Rapidograph pen to write letters on beehive base. Dot ends of letters using a stylus and Lamp (Ebony) Black.

Use #.01 Sakura Pigma Micron pen for linework on beehive and bee wings. Be sure to do the penwork after staining, otherwise it will smear.

Drill holes as indicated on the pattern. To attach bees to beehive, curl a length of 18-gauge wire around a pencil. Glue one end of the wire in the hole drilled in the bee and the remaining end into the hole drilled in the side of the beehive. Tie fabric bows to wire.

Attach beehive to base using 29gauge wire. Glue heart and hands onto beehive. Glue Spanish moss to girl's head for hair. Glue a fabric bow to her head. Attach a sawtooth hanger to back of beehive to hang.

CONSTRUCTION

Begin construction with the bottom of the tray (A). To make construction easier, the tray is designed to use a single 1" X 12" oak board. Of course, any type of wood can be used, as desired. The finished width of a 1" X 12" board is actually 3/4" X 111/4", so there is no need to rip the bottom piece for width. Cut the board to the length as given in the cutting list. Once the bottom is cut to size, it must be planed to the thickness given in the material list. When planing the wood, be sure to alternate sides on each pass through the planer to assure moisture in the wood. When planed to correct thickness, set aside.

Before the sides (B, C) can be cut to size, they must be planed to the thickness given in the cutting list. For the short sides (B), plane a piece 3" X 24". For the long sides, plane a piece 3" X 40". Once the pieces are planed. cut the sides to the dimensions given in the cutting list.

The tray handles are located in the short sides (B). Use the pattern from the pattern packet to trace the handle holes onto the short sides. Position the handles 1/2" from the top edge and centered horizontally. Pre-drill a hole in the center of each handle, and cut out with a scroll saw.

All four sides receive 45° miter cut on both ends. To ensure that the sides remain the same length, first cut a miter on a piece of scrap wood. Without removing the scrap, slide the miter gauge back towards you. Clamp a stop block to the saw and butt against the mitered edge of the scrap. If the sides are placed against the stop black before cutting, they should remain identical in length.

Rout a dado channel along the bottom inside edge of all four sides to accommodate the bottom. Use a 3/8" straight cut router bit. Cut the dado 3/8" up from the bottom of the sides

Before assembly, first dry-fit all pieces to make sure everything fits together. To assemble, spread glue evenly in the dado channel and along the mitered joints. Clamp assembly together with a belt-type clamp, using a small framing square to ensure that corners are 90°. If extra strength is desired, small brads can be nailed into the mitered joints.

When glue is dry, putty and nail holes, cracks, or gaps, as necessary. When putty is dry, sand entire tray with 150-grit sandpaper in preparation for painting.

Paint Box

PREP STEP

Seal tray with Delta Wood Sealer. When dry, sand lightly with 0000 steel wool. Wipe clean with a tack cloth. Enlarge the design to fit the tray. Transfer the oval pattern from the pattern packet to the center of the tray. Tape off the center oval

BASECOAT

Base the entire tray (except center oval) with Black Green. When dry, tape off the top edge and bottom 1/2" of the outside of the tray. Thin the hide glue with water, and apply to entire tray except taped-off areas. When dry to the touch (approximately 30 minutes), apply a thin coat of Antique White to entire tray. Do not overlap or rework areas, and move quickly as crackling begins immediately. Let dry overnight. Remember that irregularities are part of the nature and beauty of crackling. When fully dry, remove all tape. Use the script liner and Black Cherry to paint long strokes broken by two short slashes at border between crackle and non-crackle areas. Let dry.

LEAVES

Transfer the leaf patterns from the pattern packet to the tray. Base all leaves with the 3/4" Flat and Forest Green. Shadow the top and the oval side of the leaves with the 1/2" angle side-loaded with Black Green. Highlight the leaves with the same brush side-loaded Leaf Green. The stems and leaves of the leaves are painted with the liner and Black Green. Let dry.

BERRIES & FLOWERS

Transfer the remaining patterns to the tray. Base the large strawberries Opaque Red and the small strawberries Leaf Green. Base the flowers in Magnolia White. Use a stylus or the end of a brush to dot the center of the flowers with Black Green. The red berries are shaded with Black Cherry mixed with a small dab of Black and highlighted with Pumpkin. Then lightly dry-brush the centers with Bright Yellow. The green berries are shaded with Pumpkin and highlighted with Bright Yellow. Shade the flowers with Black Cherry around the core and along one side of the petals. To paint the

seeds on the strawberries, load the tip of the liner with a small amount of Black. Dab small ovals regularly spaced all over the berries. To highlight, dab smaller ovals slightly offset over the black ovals with Magnolia White. Make the small leaves at the base of the berries with a #9 Round loaded with Forest Green and then slightly dipped in Leaf Green, Load the liner in the same manner to make the berry stems. Use the stylus and Black, Antique White, and Leaf Green to make the dots at the center of the flowers.

ANTIQUING

Use the 100-grit sandpaper to distress the tray by sanding through the paint to the wood along the top edges and the outside edges. Wipe clean with a tack cloth. Antique the tray, starting with the interior. Paint entire interior with antiquing medium, wiping with a soft cloth to ensure even coating. With a clean, soft cloth, wipe off more antiquing medium from the oval, berries, and flowers. This creates highlights in these areas while the corners and edges become darker. More antiquing medium can be added to these areas if necessary. Let tray dry before finishing.

FINISH

Finish tray with several coats of Delta Satin Varnish, sanding with 0000 steel wool between each coat.
