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

#### PREP STEP

Sand any rough areas on egg and pegs with 150-grit sandpaper. Remove dust with a tack cloth. Seal egg and pegs with waterbased wood sealer.

#### PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

Use the #12 flat to base the egg and two pegs with two coats of White. Let dry completely between coats.

Transfer main pattern outlines. Transfer details as needed. Remember to follow pattern around back and sides of egg

Use the #12 flat to base the pants and the legs Nightfall.

Use the #4 flat to base the boots and belt Black. Base the bandanna with two to three coats of Pthalo Blue.

Thin Napthol Red Light with water to paint the stripes on the shirt. Use the #1 flat to paint the peg stripes. Use the #2 flat to paint the shirt stripes and bands around the wrists. Let dry.

Use the 196 liner to paint the stars White. Add fold details to the bandanna with Napa Red. Add the boot stitching with thinned Napa Red and the stitching on the pockets Straw.

Use the #4 flat to paint five belt loops, two in front, two at the sides and one centered in the back Nightfall. Base oval belt buckle, first with Dolphin, then with

Use the #10% liner and Black that has been thinned with water to paint the mouth, eyes, and eyebrows. Dot the eves Black with the stylus or the end of a brush.

Use the #4 flat to float a Fiesta Pink wash on cheeks under the eyes. Use the #2 flat to float Copen Blue on each side of both pupils. Use the 1% liner and White to add highlights to top right and bottom left of both pupils.

Use the #4 flat and a 1.9 mix of Pthalo Blue and Black to shade the folds of the



bandanna; don't forget the knot in the back. Highlight with White.

Shade under the belt loops and inside the stitching on the front pockets with Black. Float a backwards "c" stroke right past the first belt loop to the front right for the belt tongue. Use the small end of the stylus to dot White in the belt holes on the front left. Use the 1% liner to paint USA with thinned Black.

#### **EASY FINISH**

Finish the egg and pegs with several coats of gloss varnish. Let dry. Make pilot holes in the egg and pegs for the screw eyes. The wood of the egg is very dense and the eye screws break easily if the pilot hole is not deep enough. Screw in all eight eye screws. Pry open the four eve screws on the body and hang arms and legs. Gently close the eye screws with needle-nose pliers. Hot-glue ribbon to hat, overlapping ends, then hotglue hat to the egg head.

# Up North Santa Ornament



Transfer the Santa and canoe outline pattern from the pattern packet to 1/4" plywood and the star to 1/8" plywood. Cut out using a scroll saw. Sand with 150-grit sandpaper and wipe clean. Seal with wood sealer. Transfer main pattern outlines. Transfer details as needed.

#### BASECOATING

Base Santa's face and hands Fleshtone. Base his beard, mustache, and the canoe Butter Cream, Base his hat and coat Tomato Spice. Dot his eyes Black.

Base the star Pigskin and the tree Pine Green. Base the tree trunk and the paddle Spice Brown.

Base the inside of the canoe Palomino and the edging Maple Sugar. Base the bear Black. Let dry, base his eyes, muzzle, and ears Mocha Brown. Base his nose Palomino and his tongue Tomato Spice. SHADING

Shade Santa's face, hands, and the star with a float of Tomato Spice. Very lightly shade his beard, mustache and the canoe with Charcoal. Be sure the floats on the beard and mustache are

very light THE DETAILS

Use the #3 round and the #0 liner to add details. Paint the plaid on Santa's coat Black. Paint the wrapping lines on the edge of the canoe and the birch bark lines on the canoe Charcoal. All the remaining linework is done with Black.

Use an old toothbrush or a spatter brush to fleck all pieces with Magnolia White to suggest snowfall.

#### EASY FINISH

Wood-glue the star to the tree. Finish with matte spray varnish. Wrap a piece

of 24-gauge black wire as shown in the photo. Tie on a bundle of twigs with a torn fabric strip bow.

## Paint Box

#### TO ORDER A WOOD BLANK

To order a wood blank for "God Bless America," send \$15.00 + \$3 s&h to: Family Traditions, c/o Shirley Goodridge, 4336 Back River Road, Belmont, NY 14813, or call Tonya at (716) 593-3954.

#### PREP STEP

Transfer the outline pattern to the appropriate wood pieces. Cut the mama bear and base from ¾\* pine. Rout base if desired. Cut the arm, bear, and banner piece, three stars, and winss from ¾\* plwwood.

Sand each piece with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Transfer the main pattern outline. Transfer the details as needed.

#### BRUSHES

Use the #8 shader for basecoating. Use the ¼" angular for shading and high-lighting, Use the liner and rounds for details. Use an old scruffy brush for dry-brushing and the stylus to add tiny dots.

#### BASECOATING

stars Honey Brown.

Base the bears' faces, arms, and legs Milk Chocolate and their muzzles Camel. Base all the wings and the banner Antique White and the base Williamsburg Blue. Base mama's clress Deep Midnight Blue, her apron Mink Tan, and her shoes Iamo Black. Base the three

#### SHADING & HIGHLIGHTING

Shade the bears faces, arms, and legs and mama's apron with Russet. Shade the muzzles, wings, and banner with Milk Chocolate. Shade mama's dress with Lamp Black. Highlight the muzzles, shoes, and the bottom of mama's dress with Buttermilk. Dry-brush highlights on the faces, arms, and leds with Camel.

#### DETAILS

All the eyes are Lamp Black with Buttermilk highlight dots. The lettering on the banner is also Lamp Black.

The double inner lines on Mama's clress are Cranberry Wine, the outer lines are Williamsburg Blue. The zig zag pattern on the base is Antique White. All remaining linework is done with a #.005 Sakura Pigma Micron black permanent pen.

Use a spatter brush or an old toothbrush to lightly spatter all pieces with Lamp Black. Let dry completely. Antique with *DecoArt* Maple Gel Stain, following the directions on the bottle.

#### **FASY FINISH**

Sand all edges lightly with 150-grit sandpaper. Wood-glue wings to mama's back; glue arm, bear, and banner piece to mama.

Glue two stars to the banner and one to mama's wings. Make two small fabric bows and hot glue to the babies' necks. Make three more fabric bows slightly larger and hot glue to mama's shoes and neck. Hot-glue three buttons to the base, then screw the base to the bear. Finish with several coats of Americana Matte Sealer/Finisher.

# LIL' MISS LIBERTY



To order a wood blank for "Lil' Miss Liberty" send \$15.95 ppd to: The Country Elf, 57544 Hwy. 221, Story City, lowa 50248, or call (800) 325-6122 or (515) 388-4307; orders only, please.

#### PREP STEP

Transfer the outline pattern of Miss Liberty from the pattern packet to 1/2" pine. Transfer the pattern of the banner and stars to 1/8" plywood. Cut the 11/4" dowel into three 25/8" lengths. Drill holes as indicated on the pattern.

Sand the wood pieces smooth with 200-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean with a tack cloth.

Brush on DecoArt Multi-Purpose Wood Sealer, and allow to dry. Rub smooth with a piece of brown paper bag. Transfer main pattern outlines. Transfer details as needed.

#### STARS, FIRECRACKERS, & BANNER

Base the three stars Honey Brown; shade with Burnt Umber. Use a spatter brush or an old toothbrush to spatter with Lamp Black that has been thinned

with water Base firecracker #1 Napa Red. Add Snow White stripes and Honey Brown

dots. Shade with Black Plum. Base firecracker #2 Wedgewood Blue. Define each star with Honey Brown dots. Shade around each star

with Deep Midnight Blue. Base the lower area of firecracker #3 Napa Red and the upper area Wedgewood Blue. The zig zag stripes and dashes are Snow White and the dots are Honey Brown. Shade the right side of the zig zag stripes and under the upper area with Black Plum. Shade the bottom of the upper area with Deep Midnight Blue.

Base the banner Napa Red. The lettering is Khaki Tan. Shade the lettering and edges of the banner with Black Plum.



Base Miss Liberty's face, arm, hands, and feet Fleshtone. Base her hair and the flame Moon Yellow. Base her dress. the torch, and her crown Green Mist. Base her swag and the banner part of her crown Deep Teal. Base her sandals Mississippi Mud. Base one book Wedgwood Blue and the other Napa Red.

#### SHADING & HIGHLIGHTING

Shade Miss Liberty's face, nose, arm, hands, and feet with Shading Flesh; highlight with Snow White

Shade her hair and the flame with Honey Brown; highlight with Snow

Shade her dress, torch, and the crown with Deep Teal. Highlight her dress and the crown with Snow White.

Shade her swag with Black Green; highlight with Green Mist.

Shade her sandals with Burnt Umber; highlight with Khaki Tan.

Shade the Wedgewood Blue book with Deep Midnight Blue. Shade the Napa Red book with Black Plum; highlight with Cherry Red.

#### DETAILS

Blush Miss Liberty's cheeks with a dry brush of Napa Red. Be sure to remove most of the paint on a paper towel before applying.

Base the hearts on the torch Deep Teal and Miss Liberty's eyes Lamp Black. Use the stylus or the end of a small brush to add Snow White highlight dots to her eyes.

Refer to the photo to add fine detail lines with Koh-I-Noor technical pens with waterproof black ink. Finish with several coats of DecoArt Spray Acrylic Sealer.

Cut three pieces of 4-ply jute approximately 5" long. Apply a small amount of wood glue into the firecracker holes. Fold the jute in half and glue into each hole. When dry, separate the jute strands.

Use a strong adhesive to glue Miss Liberty, the banner, and the firecrackers to the grapevine wreath. Tie the stars to the wreath using the red and blue raffia. Hang where Miss Liberty's light will shine over family and friends.



# Sweet Land of Liberty

#### **CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS**

Transfer the outline patterns to the appropriate wood. The heart on the flag and the man's hat brim are cut from 1/4" plywood. The fence was purchased but can also be cut from 1/4" plywood. The woman's crown and the two signs are cut from 3/8" pine. The people, the flag, and the bird are cut from 1/2" pine.

Cut out all pieces using a scroll saw. Sand each piece with 150-grit sandpaper and wipe clean. Transfer the main pattern outlines. Transfer details as needed.

#### FACES

Base the faces Mocha; shade with Shading Flesh. The eyes are Black. Blush the cheeks with Tomato Red. Base Miss Liberty's mouth Deep Burgundy. Base Uncle Sam's nose Rookwood Red and his eyebrows Toffee. Add Light Buttermilk highlight dots to the eyes and cheeks with the stylus or the end of a small brush.

#### UNCLE SAM & MISS LIBERTY

Base Uncle Sam's beard Toffee; shade with Charcoal Grey. Paint wispy strokes first Sable Brown, then Light Buttermilk. Shade around outer edge with Sable Brown.

Uncle Sam's coat is a 1:1 mix of Blue Haze and Williamsburg Blue. Shade down the center with a mix of Deep Midnight Blue and a tad of Burnt Umber

Base Uncle Sam's pants and hat Deep Burgundy. Shade under his coat and down the center with Soft Black. Shade edges of coat and hat with Burnt Umber.

Base Uncle Sam's hat brim Deep Midnight Blue and his hatband Blue Wisp. Shade above his hatband with Soft Black; highlight the top with Toffee.

Base Miss Liberty's crown Honey Brown; shade with Bumt Sienna. Base the top of her dress Tomato Red. The bottom of her dress is a mix of Blue Mist and French Grey Blue; shade around edges with Burnt Umber. Add plaid lines with thinned Toffee.

#### THE FENCE & SIGNS

Base the fence Toffee; shade the edges with Sable Brown. Base the big sign Toffee; shade the edges with Milk Chocolate. Base the small sign Honey Brown: shade with Burnt Sienna. The border on the small sign is Deep Midnight Blue. The border on the large sign is thinned Deep Burgundy. All the lettering is a mix of Burnt Umber and a touch of Black. Base the heart on the sign Tomato Red; shade with Deep Burgundy.

#### THE FLAG

Base the top corner of the flag Uniform Blue and the rest of the flag Deep Burgundy. Let dry. Base the stripes Toffee; shade at the top with Milk Chocoolate and a tad of Burnt Umber, Add Deep Midnight Blue lines in the center of the Deep Burgundy stripes. Shade around the blue and the entire flag with Burnt Umber. Base the heart Tomato Red; shade at the top with Burnt Umber. Add thinned Toffee plaid lines. Base the button Honey Brown.

#### THE BIRD

Base the bird Blue Haze with a tad of Blue Mist added. Float the wing with a mix of Deep Midnight Blue and Blue Haze. Float the cheek with Tomato Red. Dot the eye Black. When dry, add Light Buttermilk highlight dots to the cheek and eve. Base the beak True Ochre: shade with Burnt Sienna.

#### ASSEMBLY

Sand areas to be glued. Wood-glue heart to flag and hat brim to Uncle Sam. Tie thread in button holes and glue buttons to heart and Uncle Sam's coat. Hot-glue Spanish moss onto Miss Liberty's head. Hot-glue doily around her neck. Add button to top of doily. Glue crown onto Spanish moss

Drill holes as indicated on the pattern packet. Use 18-gauge wire to attach the bird to the fence. Use 24gauge wire to attach the little sign to the fence and the flag to the wreath. Curl the ends to secure. Embellish with little strips of scrap fabric.

Add bits of Spanish moss to the wreath then wire-on the fence. Screw two small eye hooks to the back of the couple and insert wire through them to attach to the wreath. You can also add some hot glue to their backs to secure. Use a pipe cleaner to make a loop for hanging.



#### PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. The angel and her legs are cut from 3/4" pine. The wings and apron are cut from 1/4" pine. The star is cut from 1/8" pine.

Sand the rough edges with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Stain the backs and sides of the angel, legs, and wings with Minwax Provincial Stain. The apron and star are painted on all sides.

Transfer the main pattern outline Transfer the details as needed.

#### BASECOAT

Base the angel's face, legs, and hands Mink Tan. Base her dress Uniform Blue and her wings Burnt Sienna. Base the star Cranberry Wine and the apron Cranberry Wine with Buttermilk stripes. Base the dress sleeves Terra Cotta

### **DRY-BRUSH**

Use the 1/2" stencil brush to dry-brush Rookwood Red cheeks on the angel.

#### **EASY FINISH**

Sand around edges of all wood pieces. Antique the painted surfaces, using your favorite stain. Barbara uses Delta Home Decor Liquid Wood Stain (Antique Oak), Simply apply stain to painted surfaces with a brush or rag,

and wipe clean. Let dry thoroughly. Use a .50 Koh-I-Noor Rapidograph pen to write letters on the angel's apron. Dot ends of letters and the angels eyes using a stylus and Lamp Black.

Use #.01 Sakura Pigma Micron pen to add the stitching on the angel's apron. Be sure the lettering and stitching is done after you antique the wood, or it will smean

Wood-glue the apron and star onto the front of the angel and her wings onto the back.

Drill holes as indicated on the pattem in the bottom of the apron and in each leg. Also drill a hole in the top of the angel's head. Glue a halo made from 22-gauge wire into the hole. Attach legs to dress using 22-gauge wire. Glue the buttons in each upper corner of the apron. Glue black sewon-snaps onto the angel's dress.

To make angel's hair, loop hair loosely around four fingers six times. and tie in the center with a length of hair. Use scissors to clip both ends of hair. Glue hair to head. Glue a fabric bow to hair.

Cut tops from tea-dyed baby socks. Stitch around tops of baby socks using burgundy embroidery thread. Position socks onto angel's legs and secure in place by tightening thread and tying behind legs. Attach a sawtooth hanger to the back of the angel to hang

# BARBARA LLOYD

A survey of Barbara Lloyd's painted designs reveals a wonderful warmth, sweetness, and simplicity that many new painters respond to with enthusiasm. It think I could do this!" they say when they see her projects at craft shows and in books and magazines. Barbara wouldn't have it any other way, for that is exactly how she herself found her creative niche in painting. With no formal art training, she picked up a paintbush as an adult

While always enjoying crafty pursuits—especially drawing and sewing-as a child, Barbara chose what she considered a more practical career choice by majoring in medical technology in college. She worked in the medical field for six years. In 1990 along with her mother, sister, and sister-in-law began to attend craft fairs. Decorative painting on wood appealed to her. Beginning with the simple designs of other artists, she made projects which sold well at craft fairs.

and uncovered her talent.

Soon her desire to design her own projects grew, and

she knew that in order to do what she wanted she'd have to acquire her own scroll saw. That was the key! As she started to work with her own original shapes her ideas began to take flight. Her sales at shows quadrupled. She confesses, "I'm a "Type A' personality. I don't like repetition! I want something new with every project." With such a tendency, it was natural that Barbara should consider publishing her designs.

In May of 1994 Barbara contacted Darrow Production Co., thinking that they might be interested in publishing her designs in leaflets or books. "I was so naive! I just sent them a few of my models—one of a kind—and waited to hear from them." Two months went by before she received a letter... Darrow loved her designs but had been unable to reach her by phone (she was working full-time, after all) and wanted her to "put a book together" within three weeks! Evenings and weekends were spent in a frenzy of painting, but Barbara rose to the occasion and was very pleased with the printed result.

Darrow provided the right advice and support for the fledgling artist, and published six books of Barbara's



designs: the "We've Just Begun" series. With sales good and her confidence high, she began to consider self-publishing. To do this, she knew she would have to quit her full-time job to devote more time to her business. By the summer of 1997, Barbara, was ready for this huge step. She is now working on her ninth book.

Barbara describes her style as rocuntry primitive"—simple and basic, with the warm, country colors she loves so much. She finds this style very well received in the matetaplace. The shapes are uncomplicated, the painting is easy, and each piece derives its charm from the add-ons that make Barbara's work so appealing—buttons, bits of fabric, doll hair, baby socks. Her favorite subject "characters" include angels, bunnies, bears, and lots of "little folks." #### PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns for the girl and welcome sign from the pattern packet to 3/4" pine. Transfer the pattern of the wings, arms, and stars to 1/4" birch plywood. Cut out all pieces using a scroll saw.

Sand each piece with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Stain all wood pieces with Delta Antique Oak Wood Stain or the stain of your choice. While still wet, wipe the stain with a lint-free rag. Allow stain to dry for one hour. Sand lightly to remove burrs. Transfer the main pattern outlines. Transfer the details as needed.

#### BASECOAT

Use the 1/2" wash to base Sue's face and hands Medium Flesh, her dress Tomato Spice and her wings Cape Cod Blue.

Base the welcome sign Light Ivory and all the stars Empire Gold

Use the #6 shader to add the lettering on the sign Tomato Spice.

Use the 1/2" stencil brush and the 3/4" star stencil to apply Empire Gold stars to Sue's dress.

#### SHADING

Use the 1/2" angular shader to shade Sue's face and hands with Cayenne and her dress with Candy Bar Brown. Shade her wings with Midnight Blue and the banner and wooden stars with Autumn Brown. Highlight the stars. Sue's hands, and

and the letters with White. Use an old scruffy brush to blush

Sue's cheeks with Delta Garnet Red Stencil Creme.

Use the #0 liner to base her eyes and mouth with Black. Float a White highlight on the left side of each eye with the 1/2" angular shader.

#### DETAILS

Use the #0 liner to paint the highlight marks on Sue's eyes and the lettering with White. Paint squiggly lines around Sue's wings with Midnight Blue and on the banner with Tomato Spice. Use a stylus to dot the letters. Sue's eyes. cheeks, and dress with White.

Use an old toothbrush or a spatter brush to spatter all pieces lightly. avoiding Sue's face, first with thinned White, then with Black.

#### MAKING THE FLAG

To assemble the flag, cut one piece of red and white fabric 5" long and 3" wide. Cut one piece of blue fabric 3" long and 11/2" wide. Cut a 1/8" dowel 5" long.

Dip one end of dowel into Delta Tacky Glue and spread glue on the inside half of the red fabric (the wrong side). Fold red fabric in half with dowel rod glued in the fold to form the flag. Apply Tacky Glue to piece of blue fabric; fold this piece in half over the top of red fabric. Glue a 3/4" wooden star to the center of the blue fabric. Glue end of dowel into Sue's hand.

#### **EASY FINISH**

Brush all wooden stars with Delta Sparkle Glaze; while still wet, sprinkle them with DecoArt Glamour Dust, blow off excess. After Sparkle Glaze dries, brush stars again with sparkle glaze (this will help keep Glamour Dust on the stars). Wood-glue the stars to the banner and the wings to Sue's back. Use hot glue to attach hair, bow, lace collar, and buttons.

Cut one piece of 19-gauge wire 17" long and two pieces 8" long. Thread the 17" piece through the holes in the top of the banner, pull around the back and twist wire ends in place to secure. Thread one piece of 8" wire through the hole in the bottom of the banner and top of Sue's wings, pull wire around the back and twist wire ends in place to secure. Repeat for opposite side. Spray with Delta Satin Finish Spray. Let Starry Sue welcome friends all year 'round.

#### PREP STEP

Transfer the outline pattern of the girl from the pattern packet to 3/4" pine and her arms to 3/8" pine. Transfer the pattern for the sign and fence to 1/4" plywood. Cut out all pieces using a scroll saw.

Refer to the measurements in the Paint Box and the illustration in the pattem packet for building the seed keeper. Sand all pieces with 150-grit sandpaper and wipe clean. Transfer the main pattern outlines. Transfer details as needed.

#### BASECOAT

Base the girl's face, neck, hands, and legs Maple Sugar; shade with Burnt Sienna. Base her eyes Black. Highlight the lower left corners with Blue Jay. Add a tiny dot of White to upper right corners. Base her nose Maple Sugar and Burnt Sienna, and her mouth Barn Red. Add Burnt Sienna freckles and blush her cheeks with chalk

Base her hair with a Burnt Sienna wash; shade next to face with Brown Iron Oxide. Base her headband Dark Goldenrod; highlight and detail with Moon Yellow.

Base the girl's shoes Black and the seed keeper pieces Pineneedle Green. Highlight the upper portion of each slat with Dusty Sage. Base the bag Flesh Tan; shade with Spice Tan.

Base the sign Flesh Tan; shade edges with Spice Tan. Paint the border and the wire Dusty Blue. The dots are Dark Goldenrod.

The lettering on the sign and seed bag is done with a fine-line permanent black pen. Fill in lines on the seed bag with Rouge

Base the fence Antique White; shade with Mudstone. Base both birds Light Blue; shade with Dusty Blue. Add a wash of Rouge to blush cheeks. Base beaks Dark Goldenrod; highlight with Moon Yellow. Dot eyes Black.

#### FLOWERS

Base the highlighted areas of the red flowers Rouge; base remaining area Barn Red. Blend together while still wet. Add additional highlights with Rouge and Maple Sugar. Add addition-

al shade with Burnt Sienna. Base the blue flower Dusty Blue. Shade designated area with Midnight Blue: highlight with Light Blue.

Base the centers of the red and blue flowers Dark Goldenrod; highlight with Moon Yellow

Base the tulips Rouge: shade Barn Red; highlight with Rouge and Maple Sugar.

Base the vellow flowers Dark Goldenrod: shade around the centers with Burnt Sienna; highlight with Moon Yellow. Base the center Rouge; shade with Barn Red. Highlight center with Rouge and Maple Sugar.

Use a stylus or the end of a small brush to add dots around the centers of the flower on the sign and the two vellow flowers with Moon Yellow

Base all leaves Pineneedle Green; highlight with Dusty Sage. Add Dusty Sage stem to the tulips and vein details on the leaves

#### DRESS

Base the highlighted areas of the girl's dress Rouge; base remaining areas Barn Red. Blend together while still wet. Use a #2 flat to paint the plaid Dark Goldenrod. Paint the squares formed by intersecting lines with Moon Yellow. Add a thin line of Moon Yellow to each side of the plaid lines. (You may want to use an extender or Delta Color Float to paint the lines.)

Base the girl's bodice Antique White; add Barn Red detail lines at top and bottom. Paint the bow Black and the sleeve trim Moon Yellow.

#### ASSEMBLY

To assemble the seed keeper, stretch screen over the frame bottom, overlapping screen to sides. Nail and glue side strips to keeper; then front and back sections. Be sure that it is stretched fairly tight. Wood-glue and nail the fence to the front of the seed keeper with 5/8" brads.

Drill hole in hand and sign to accommodate 19-gauge wire. Add a drop of glue to each end of wire and attach sign to hand. Drill 1/4" hole in feet and center back of seed keeper. Join with 1" length of 1/4" dowel and wood glue.

#### PREP STEP

Sand the brush holder box with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean.

#### BRUSHES

Use the shaders for basecoating. Use the size that best fits the area. Use the 1/4" angular shader for shading and highlighting. Use the liner and round for adding small details. Use an old scruffy brush for dry-brushing. Use the stylus or the end of a small brush to add dots

#### BASECOAT

Basecoat the entire outside of the box and the inside of the cover French Grey Blue. Let dry completely. Stencil checks with a 1/2" checkerboard stencil and Light French Blue on the front and sides of the box

Transfer the main outlines onto the box with transfer paper. Transfer details as needed

Base all flower petals Antique Gold and the centers Burnt Sienna. Base the stems and leaves Forest Green and the plant pot Oxblood. Base the step stool and plant stand Sable Brown.

Rase the bears Honey Brown, Base the bottom of their feet and the little bear's muzzle Khaki Tan.

Base the little bear's dress Shading Flesh and her collar Light Buttermilk.

Base mama bear's dress Green Mist. her apron Antique Rose, and her petticoat Light Buttermilk

Base the bunny Khaki Tan and the bottom of his hands and feet Yellow Ochre. Base the brush handle Lamp Black, the bristles Desert Sand, and the tip Burnt Sienna

#### SHADING & HIGHLIGHTING

Shade around the flower centers with a Burnt Sienna wash. Dry-brush the centers with Light Buttermilk. Shade the

stem and leaves with Midnite Green.

Highlight the tops of the leaves and the center of the stem with Green Mist.

Shade the plant pot, the plant stool, and the step stool with Antique Maroon. Highlight the plant pot with Shading Flesh and the step stool and plant stand with Desert Sand.

Shade the bears with Burnt Sienna; highlight with Desert Sand. Shade the bottom of their feet and the little bear's muzzle with Sable Brown; highlight with Desert Sand

Shade the little bear's dress with Antique Rose; highlight with Light Buttermilk, Shade her collar with Light French Blue.

Shade the bunny, his hands, and feet with Sable Brown; highlight with Desert Sand

Shade mama bunny's dress with Midnite Green: highlight with Light Buttermilk. Shade her apron with Napa Red: highlight with Shading Flesh. Shade her petticoat with Light French

Shade around the outside of all the items on the box with Deep Midnight Blue

#### DETAILS

Add the double linework to the flower centers with Light Buttermilk. Add the double linework to mama bear's dress Midnite Green and the single linework Light Buttermilk. Add the stitching to the bunny with Sable Brown.

#### DETAILS

Base the bunny and the little bear's eves and noses with Lamp Black. Base the hearts on the little bear's dress Antique Rose Blush the cheeks with a dry-brush of Antique Rose

Add a narrow band of Midnite Green at the end of mama bear's sleeves, the top back of her dress, and the bottom of her dress

Use the stylus to add the buttons on mama bear's dress and the highlight dots to the eyes. Add dots around the center of the flowers first with Light Buttermilk, then Lamp Black, and finally Napa Red

All the remaining linework, including the mouths and eyebrows, is done with a #.005 Sakura Micron Pigma black permanent pen.

#### FASY FINISH

Finish with several coats of Americana Matte Sealer/Finisher. Now your painting will be twice as fun!



#### PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. Cut the the teacher and chalkboard piece from 3/4" pine. Cut the teacher's arm, the books, the pencil, and the apple from 1/2" pine. Cut the leaf from 1/4" birch plywood. Cut a 1/4" dowel 11/2" long for the chalk

Drill 1/16" holes as indicated on the pattern. Sand all pieces with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean.

To seal the wood, make a 1:1 mix of DecoArt Wood Sealer and DecoArt Oak Gel Stain. Cover all the wood pieces completely, then wipe dry with a paper towel. This will stain and seal your wood in one easy step. Transfer the main pattern outlines. Transfer the details as needed

#### BRUSHES

Base with the 3/4" flat wash and the #14 shader. The details are done with the #1% script liner and the #2 round.

#### BASECOAT

Base the teacher's face and hands Medium Flesh and her hair Moon Yellow: Base her dress, headband, and one book Uniform Blue. Base the other book and the leaf Leaf Green. Base the pages of the books and the point of the pencil Desert Sand.

Base the pencil Marigold and the eraser Shading Flesh. Base the metal part of the pencil Shimmering Silver. Base the apple and the rose Cherry Red and the chalk Light Buttermilk. Base the center of the chalkboard Lamp Black.

#### THE APPLE

Dry-brush highlights in the center of the apple with Blush Flesh. Make fine vertical lines with the same color. Shade the outside edge of the apple with Napa Red. Spatter lightly with Lt. Buttermilk







#### THE LEAF, PENCIL, & BOOKS

Highlight the top of the leaf with a mix of Leaf Green and Lt. Buttermilk. Shade the vein with Hauser Dark Green. Base the stem with Sable Brown and shade with Burnt Umber.

Highlight the center section of the pencil with a mix of Marigold and Lt. Buttermilk. Shade the same section with Raw Sienna. Shade the point of the pencil and the pages of the books with Khaki Tan. Shade the metal on the pencil with Lamp Black. Shade the eraser with Lt. Cinnamon, Paint the lead with Lamp Black

Shade the green book with Hauser Dark Green. Shade the blue book with Deep Midnight Blue. Shade the chalkboard frame with Lt. Cinnamon. Paint the letters on the books and the chalkboard with Lt. Buttermilk.

#### THE TEACHER

Load Raspberry on an old scruffy brush and wipe dry on a paper towel. Using a circular motion, rub in her cheeks.

Shade her forehead and on both hands next to the sleeves with Shading Flesh. Highlight the top of her hair with Taffy Cream; shade with Raw Sienna. Dot her eyes with Uniform Blue; highlight with Lt. Buttermilk.

Using the 5%" circle template and the #.01 Sakura Pigma Micron permanent black pen outline her glasses. Also dot her freckles and her expression lines.

Highlight her chest and the left side of the separate sleeve with French Grev/Blue. Dot her dress with Lt. Buttermilk. Make a brush mix of Cherry Red and Lt. Buttermilk and line the center of the rose. Line again with the Pigma pen when dry.

#### **FASY FINISH**

Using the Pigma pen, outline all the pieces and the book pages with a broken line. Glue the leaf to the apple, the chalk in the teacher's hand, the separate arm to the chalkboard and the rose to her hatband with Aleene's Tacky Glue. Spray the entire piece with Deco Art Matte Spray Sealer

#### **ASSEMBLY**

Cut three pieces of linen jute 12" long and one piece 18" long. Tie the pencil and apple on with the 12" pieces. Use the other 12" piece for the green book and the 18" piece for the blue book. Tie on the books together and then glue the blue book on top of the green one. Make a bow for each tie and trim the ends. This makes a thoughtful gift for a favorite teacher.

#### PREP STEP

"Transfer the outline patterns to the appropriate wood. Cut the body, two arms, and two feet from ¾" pine. Cut the banner from ¼" birch plywood. Drill tiny holes as indicated on the pattern.

Slightly round the edges of all pieces, using a belt or hand sander. Sand smooth with 100 then 220-grit sandpaper, and dust off. Transfer main pattern outlines. Transfer details later as needed.

#### PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS

Base the angel's face and hands Medium Flesh. Base her dress and sleeves Mink Tan, her pantaloons Toffee, her socks, and the banner Buttermilk. Base the heels and toes of the socks Red Iron Oxide.

Dry-brush the angel's cheeks with Red Iron Oxide. Dot the eyes with Lamp Black. When dry, add Butternilk highlight dots to each eye and cheek using the stylus or the end of small brush.

Add Jamp Black lettering to the banner, shade and line with Russet. Line the dress and sleeves with Red Iron Oxide, shade with Burnt Uniber. Line the part taloors with Sable Brown. Add Red Iron Oxide dots. When dots are dry, shade with Sable Brown, Shade the socia with Sable Brown; shade the heel and toe of the socia with Russet.

## BASECOAT APRON SQUARES Base apron squares as follows:

Base apron squares as follows squares 1.8.12—French Grey Blue squares 2, 5.8.16—Light Avocado squares 3, 7, 9.8.11—Camel squares 4, 8, 10.8.15—Toffee squares 6, 13.8.14—Red Iron Oxide.

Note: After basecoating each piece, let dry and sand lightly.

#### SHADE APRON SQUARES

Shade apron squares as follows: squares 1 & 12-Deep Midnight Blue squares 9, 5 & 16-Evergreen squares 3, 7, 9 & 11-Raw Sienna squares 4, 8, 10 & 15-Sable Brown squares 6, 13 & 14-Russet.

#### APRON SQUARE DETAILS

Detail apron squares as follows: squares 1 & 12 linework-Toffee

squares 2, 5 & 16 squiggly lines— Evergreen

squares 3, 7, 9 & 11 checks-Raw Sienna

squares 4, 8, 10 & 15 hearts—Red Iron Oxide and leaves—Light Avocado squares 6, 13 & 14 flat stripes—Russet and thin double lines—Buttermilk.

Use a #.1 Sakura Pigma Micron permanent black pen to add the stitches and "x's" between squares.

#### ANTIQUING INSTRUCTIONS

You can use your own favorite antiquing medium, or try Myra's Paste Wax method: Mix 1 cup JW's Paste Wax with 'V teaspoon each Burnt Umber and Burnt Sienna oil paint. Apply mixture with a sponge brush to all pieces. Wipe dry with a clean cloth. Let dry for 15 minutes and buff with a clean, dry cloth.

Deepen antiquing around edges with a cloth dipped in a 1:1 mix of Burnt Umber and Burnt Sienna oil paint. Wipe nearly dry on paper towel. Rub gently around edges to darken. Use a clean cloth to blend into lighter areas.

Use a spatter brush or an old toothbrush to spatter lightly first with Light Buttermilk, then with Lamp Black. Avoid spattering the angel's face.

#### **ASSEMBLY**

Attach the legs and arms with jute tied in the back to secure.

Hot-glue clumps of *Kurley Tresses* hair to the angel's head for hair. Tie a bow of torn scrap fabric and hot-glue to her head.

Cut a tea-stained 3½" dia. doily in half and hot-glue to her neck. Tie linen thread through the buttons and glue to doily and quilt squares; refer to the photograph for placement.

Cut wings from rusly tin and glue and nail to the back of the angel. Cut two 5\* pieces of 19-gauge wire. Attach banner to hands curling both ends to secure. Attach a sawtooth hanger to the back to hang. This sweet angel makes a loving gift for your family or special friend.



L his is the last project in our six-part series by Kathy Morrissey. This project was designed to house your mail and keep

your counter tidy.



To order a wood blank for "Fly Away" Post Office Letter Holder" send \$12.95 to: Cabin Crafters, 1225 W. 1st Street, Nevada, IA 50201 or call (800) 669-3920 or (515) 382-5406.

#### PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to 3/4" pine. Sand all pieces with 400-grit sandpaper. Wipe clean. Varnish with Delta Waterbased Varnish, sand again, and wipe clean

Basecoat entire surface with an equal mixture of Sandstone and Light Ivory. Base the bottoms and backs of the front and back pieces Dolphin. Base the entire center piece Dolphin. Varnish entire piece one coat to protect the wash. Transfer main pattern outlines. Transfer details as needed.

#### THE POST OFFICE

Base the post office roof Dolphin; shade Williamsburg Blue. Shade the post office and all the fences with an equal mix of Sandstone and Trail. Base the tree trunk, mailbox post, and door with this same mixture; shade with Autumn Brown.

Base the trees and shrubs Silver Pine: shade with Blue Spruce.

Base the flag on the mailbox and the hearts on the post office Rose Cloud; shade with Rose Mist. Base the flag handle Hippo Gray. Base the mailbox Drizzle Grey; shade with Hippo Gray. Base the letter Western Sunset, shade with Autumn Brown. Base the small letter Light Ivory; shade with Western Sunset. Base the stamps and the birdhouse roof and heart Williamsburg Blue. Shade the roof with Blueberry.

Base the birdhouse Rose Cloud; shade with Rose Mist. Base the birdhouse roof and heart Williamsburg Blue; shade with Blueberry. Use the stylus or the end of a small brush to dot the perch with Blueberry.

#### EASY FINISH

All lining, lettering, the door handle, hinges, and stitching are Charcoal. All dots are made using marker. Let dry overnight to allow marker to set.

Finish with several coats of Delta Waterbased Varnish, allowing adequate drying time between coats. Use Aleene's Tacky Glue to glue the middle piece to the front and back pieces. This should complete your six part series of kitchen accessories by Kathy Morrissey. If you have missed any of the other pieces that were in our last five issues, they are still available. #### PREP STEP

Transfer the outline pattern of the frame and base from the pattern packet to ¾4 pine. Transfer the wings, hearts, and the angel's nose to ¾7 ply. Transfer the angel's head to ¼7 plywood. Cut out all pieces using a scroll saw.

Sand each piece with 150-grit sandpaper and wipe clean. Transfer details after basecoating.

#### THE ANGEL

Wood-glue the nose to the angel's face. Allow to dry.

Base the angel's head Blush. Use the #% round to add True Fuchsia cheeks and Black eyes.

Base her wings True Lime. Use the #6 shader to add True Apricot stripes.

Base the two small hearts True Fuchsia. Use the #96 round to add True.

Orange dots.

Her mouth and the stitching around her wings are Black, done with the #1% liner.

#### THE BASE

Base the top of the base True Poppy and the sides and bottom True Blue. Paint True Apricot dots on the front edge.

#### THE FRAME

Base the frame Deep Lavender. Use the #8 shader to add Black checks along the front edge.

#### THE HEARTS

Base the large heart True Red. Use the #6 shader to paint the plaid lines True Turquoise.

#### EASY FINISH

Finish all wood pieces with Aleene's Enhancers Gloss Varnish. Staple the screen to the back of the frame. Drill holes as indicated on the pattern.

Cut six 4' long pieces of Plum Kurly Tresses' hair. "Tie in the middle with one strand. Tear a strip of Turquoise fabric or cut a piece of ribbon. Tie a bow in the middle of the hair. Use Aleene's Tacky Glue and glue to the top of the angel's head.

Cut a piece of 8-gauge black wire 4\* long. Form a loop on one end and twist around the "stem" for the halo. Glue into the hole in the top of the angel's head.

Glue the wings to the back of the angel's head. Glue the two small hearts to her wings.

Cut one piece of a 1/4" dia. dowel 3/4" long. Glue one end into the angel's neck and the other into the top of the frame.

Cut two pieces of %\* dowel ¾\* long. Give one into each side of the frame bottom and the other ends into the base. Give the large heart to the bottom right side of the frame.

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

#### **BUILDING INSTRUCTIONS** Transfer the frame pattern outline

from the pattern packet to 1/2" pine and the back piece to 3/8" pine.

Sand both pieces with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Seal with Delta Waterbased Wood Sealer. Sand and wipe again.

#### BASECOAT

#### Basecoat the entire frame and the back piece with Blue Haze. Allow the paint to dry thoroughly.

Lightly sand the surface to give it a time-worn look. Expose some of the wood along the edges and on the corners. Transfer the pattern.

Base the tree trunks and branches Autumn Brown. Base the leaves Forest Green. Base the birds and the hearts Tomato Spice

#### **DETAILS & SHADING**

Use a liner brush to add skinny bark lines to the trees with Dark Burnt Umber that has been thinned with water. The leaves have Dark Burnt Umber sterns and veins. Add tiny Pigskin dots at the bottom of each leaf

Shade along the bottom and inside edge of each tree with softly floated Dark Burnt Umber. Shade along the backs of the birds with Dark Burnt Umber. The lines that imply wings, the legs, the eye dots, the polywog tail feathers, and the lettering are all Dark Burnt Umber. Base their tiny beaks Pigskin.

#### **EASY FINISH**

Allow the paint to dry, remove any pattem lines, then give the piece a coat of watered-down varnish (2:1-varnish to water) before antiquing with Delta Waterbased Antiquing Medium. Let dry thoroughly before finishing with Delta Waterbased Matte Finish.

#### ASSEMBLY

Center hinge and stand on the top of the frame; attach with the nails provided. Tape mirror or photo to the back

# Miss Lizzy's Summer Birdhouse

#### PREP STEP

Transfer the outline patterns from the pattern packet to the appropriate wood. Cut Miss Lizzy, her arms, and the sign from 3/8" plywood. Cut all the flowers from 1/4" plywood. Drill holes for wire in Miss Lizzy as indicated on the pattern and in the top of the sign.

Refer to the Paint Box to cut the birdhouse pieces. Drill three 11/4" holes in the front piece of the birdhouse. Measure down from the top of the roof for the first 6", the second 17", and the third 97". Overlap the 41/2" x 5" roof side to form the roof. Trace the roof angle on the top of the front and back pieces to form the roof peak. Sandwich the sides between the front and back pieces and secure with nails. Secure to the base.

Sand all pieces, except the birdhouse, with 150-grit sandpaper, and wipe clean. Seal the wood with DecoArt Wood Sealer, Let dry, sand again, and wipe clean. Transfer the main pattern outlines. Transfer the details as needed.

#### BASECOAT

Base Miss Lizzy's face and hands Base Flesh and her hair and boots Dark Chocolate. Base her dress, the papermache box, and her arms Khaki Tan. Base the sign Napa Red. Base her hat, the cuff at the bottom of her dress, and the edges of the birdhouse roof Colonial Green.

#### THE FLOWERS & LEAVES

Base two large flowers Colonial Green, three Marigold, two Napa Red, and four Raspberry. Base two small flowers Raspberry, one Napa Red, and one Colonial Green.

Base the flower on Miss Lizzy's hat Raspberry and the one on her neck Napa Red. Base the four craft sticks and all the leaves Plantation Pine.

#### STENCILING

Use a 1/4" checkerboard stencil and a small stencil brush to stencil Antique White checks on Miss Lizzy's dress. Use a 3/16" checkerboard stencil to stencil her arms and the paper-mache box with Antique White checks. Stencil small rectangles on the dress cuff with Teal Green.

#### SIGN, FLOWER, LEAF DETAILS

Add the lettering on the sign with the IS 1% liner and White. Dot the ends of the letters with the end of a small brush. Line around the sign with Spice Pink. Thinning the paint with water will help the lines flow easily. Add the detail lines to the leaves with Silver Sage Green

Line the Napa Red flowers with Spice Pink paint centers Pumpkin. Line the Colonial Green flowers with White; paint centers Raspberry. Line the Marigold flowers Burnt Sienna-paint centers Spice Pink. Line the Raspberry flowers with a mix of Spice Pink and White: paint the centers Pumpkin. When the centers are dry, add a few dots of a mix of Spice Pink and White to the center of each flowwar

#### SHADING & HIGHLIGHTING

Float Lamp Black down the center of Miss Lizzy's boots to divide her feet. Highlight next to the float with a float of

a Marigold and Burnt Sienna mix. Shade Miss Lizzy's face and hands with Shading Flesh. Shade her hat with Teal Green: highlight with Indian

Turquoise. Use the 1/2" rake to add detail to Miss Lizzy's hair, first with Burnt Sienna, then with Antique White. Use the JS 196 liner to add lines with Antique White.

Highlight her mouth, cheeks, and eyes with White.

#### **DETAILS**

Paint Miss Lizzy's eyes, mouth, nose, and eyebrows Black. Rouge her cheeks with a dry-brush of Blush Flesh

Add the buttons and the stitching on Miss Lizzy's boots Marigold. Line her hands with Burnt Sienna.

Paint the thick plaid lines on Miss Lizzy's hat Napa Red. Paint Khaki Tan lines next to the Napa Red lines.

#### **BIRDHOUSE ROOF**

Use the #10 flat to simulate checkerboard pattern on the edge of the roof Stroke the squares first with Colonial Green, then add a dry-brush of Teal Green over them.

#### **EASY FINISH**

Use 24-gauge copper wire to attach the sign to Miss Lizzy's arm and her arms to her body. Refer to the photgraph to glue the flowers to her hat, neck, dress, the birdhouse, and the sign. Nail the old rusated horseshoe nails to the birdhouse for perches. Wood-glue and nail Miss Lizzy to the birdhouse and the papermache box to the birdhouse base. Glue the seed packets and four small flowers to the craft sticks. Cut green florist foam to fit the paper-mache box and top with Spanish moss. Arrange the flowers and seed packets in the box.



#### CONSTRUCTION

Cut the top (A) to the dimensions given in the cutting list. The comers of the top must be rounded: measure 1' in from each comer and scribe an arc between these two points. Cut the corners with a scroll or band saw. Sand the top smooth and round all sharp edges by hand or with a belt sander.

Gut the legs (B) to the dimensions given in the cutting list. Transfer the pattern for the legs to the wood, making sure the end grain is located on the top and bottom of the legs. Set the blade of a table saw or radial arm saw to 15° and cut the top of each leg. Clamp a stop block 6½° from the blade to ensure that the lengths of each leg are identical. Flip each leg piece over and cut the bottom. Be careful that the angle cuts on the ends remain parallel or the stool will not sit flat when finished. Now cut out the pattern

traced onto the legs with a scroll or band saw. Sand the legs smooth. The legs are attached to the top with

biscuits and glue only. Before cutting the biscuit slots, you must carefully lay out the location of the cuts. To begin, clamp a leg flat on the underside of the top. It should be positioned 3" from the edge and 3/4" from each side. The slots for the biscuits should be centered in the leg edge and located 91/2" from the ends. Transfer these layout lines to the underside of the top. See diagram A above to assist in the layout. Cut the biscuit slots, following the manufacturer's instructions for your biscuit cutter. Be sure to wear eve protection. Repeat for the other leg. Attach legs with biscuits and glue. Clamp stool together and let fully dry.

Cut the middle brace (C) to the dimensions given in the cutting list. The

ends of the brace must be cut at a 15° angle. The distance between the long points on the brace is 101½°. After the brace is cut, sand smooth.

IXWXT

To attach brace, add a thin layer of glue to the ends and push into place between the legs. The brace will be difficult to clamp in this position, but a weight placed on top of the brace works well. Make sure the brace remains straight. When glue is dy, drill two 9/n° holes through each leg into the ends of the brace about 11½ deep. Apply wood glue to four wood dowels and insert into holes. Wijpe off excess glue. When dry, cut dowels flush and sand smooth.

Place the stool on a flat surface to make sure it does not wobble. Sand any high spots on the legs until the stool sits flat and stable.

# Paint

#### PREP STEP

Sand entire stool with 150-grit sandpaper, then wipe clean with a tack cloth. Seal the stool with Delta Waterbased Sealer

#### BASECOAT

Base the entire stool with Colonial Blue and the 916" bristle brush, Let dry. Paint the edges of the top and the edges of the legs with Avalon Blue and the #14 flat. Let dry. Transfer the lamb pattern with graphite paper to the top of the stool.

#### THE LAMB

Begin by painting the hooves with Black and the #4 Flat. Pour the White paint into a small pool and let sit until it starts to thicken. While waiting for the paint to thicken, dip a large stiff bristle brush (stencil brush) into White paint. Dab off most of paint onto a paper towel for a drybrush effect. Stipple around the lamb, slightly covering the graphite lines. This gives the lamb the soft, fluffy look of wool rather than a hard edge.

When the pool of White is thickened, apply (don't paint!) it to the lamb. Use the #10 Round and scoop up the paint, place it where you want it, then pull the brush out from underneath the paint. It is very much like shoveling. Do not apply the paint to the very edges of the lamb because it will ruin the soft. "fluffy" look achieved with the stippling. Apply the thickened paint to the entire lamb, including the legs and face. There is enough room to get several rows of applied paint to each leg. Let paint dry thoroughly, which takes some time.

#### DETAILS

Transfer the face pattern to the lamb Base the lamb's eve with Charcoal and the #4 round. Sideload the 1/4" angle brush with Charcoal and shade in the lamb's nose, upper eve-lid, the inside of her ear, the fold lines in the wool around her neck, the beginning of her tail, between her legs, and her belly. Reload the same unwashed brush with Santa Fe Rose and reshade over the same areas to soften the lines and add depth.

Paint the lamb's lips and around her eve lightly, with the 1/4" angle brush sideloaded with Santa Fe Rose only. Repeat for the inside of the ear, but use a heavier hand.

Load the #4 round with a 1:1 mixture of Charcoal and Santa Fe Rose, Lighten the eye, leaving the pupil dark. Add a small dab of White with the stylus for a highlight where the eye and pupil meet.

#### FINISH

When paint is dry, heavily distress the edges and corners of the stool with 150-grit sandpaper. Wipe stool clean with a tack cloth

Antique the stool with Delta Dark Brown Antiquing Gel. Let the gel sit for a few minutes on the top of the stool because you want it to really get into the "folds" of the "wool." Wipe off the excess gel with a clean soft cloth. Leave the corners and edges of the stool darker. Work and reapply the gel until you achieve the effect of depth in the "wool." Make sure you use clean, all-cotton rags for this. Old T-shirts work perfect. Varnish stool when dry. This child's stool is sure to be a favorite with your Little Bo Peep.
