

# SWAT WOODTURNING SYMPOSIUM AUGUST 26-28 in WACO, TX

The **Southwest Association of Wood Turners** host their 27th annual *SWAT Symposium*, Aug. 24-26, at the Convention Center in Waco, TX. This is the second largest annual woodturning conference, featuring nationally and internationally-recognized turners, as well as outstanding regional turners.

It began in 1992, as a regional symposium for those who

had neither the time nor the money to go to a national event. Known as *Texas Turn or Two*, the first meeting was run on a shoe-string budget in **Mark Potter's** shop in Columbus, TX, drawing 80 attendees.

Each year, the conference continued to grow, requiring larger and larger facilities. Today, the conference is sponsored by 27 participating clubs from Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana and attracts over 800 attendees from across the U.S.

Offering something for every level of woodturner, this year's program features 56 sessions with lead demonstrators **Stuart Batty**,

Keith Gotschall, George Hatfield, Dan Tilden, Craig Timmerman, and Alan & Lauren Zenreich. Regional demonstrators include Jim Burt, Gary Barnes, Kevin Bassett, Tom Canfield, Ken Cardin, Andy Chen, Jim Creel, Jerry Degroot, Cindy Drozada, Dennis Ford, Jeff Hornung, Sammy Long, Tod Raines, Toni Ramsfield, John Schlobohm, Lee Sky, John Solberg, James Thurman, Donald Ward, and Cory White.

On Friday night, there is the *Turnoff Throwdown*. The preliminary event features competition between local favorite **Buddy Compton** and South Carolina darling **Ashley Harwood**, with the winner taking on the current champion **Stuart Batty**.

Spectators will be served a Cajun Dinner (\$13).

In addition, there is an Art Gallery, banquet, drawings for artwork and tools, a vendor exhibit hall, hands-on instructional areas, Woman-in-Turning meeting, and a full schedule of activities with special classes designed for non-turning family members. SWAT will again host Beads of Courage, whereby attendees contribute turned boxes for children undergoing life-saving treatments.

Registration fees are \$140 (by Aug. 8) or \$175 on-site. Registration includes demonstrations, access to all vendors, daily lunch, and access to the *Woodturners' Art* 

Gallery. Symposium Banquet and Friday night Cajun Dinner tickets are extra. Discounts are available to spouses and students, and reduced rates are offered for hotel accommodations. For info, visit the website: www.swaturners.org or call Clyde Little, (512) 413-6931.

### Woodworking Observations

Pam and I had a bittersweet moment in revisiting the home of the Lipton Wood Art Collection, Dr. Irving Lipton had been the foremost patron of wood art in the last three decades of the 20th Century, and except for objects that were bequest to museums after his passing in 2001, the remainder of the over 2,000 pieces have remained undisturbed in a dedicated condominium. It is like entering a time capsule, offering a snapshot of the contemporary wood field during a period of growth and maturation.

The reason for the visit was that the family has moved to the next phase of liguidating the inventory that their father passionately acquired. In May, 148 pieces were put up for auction, to benefit the Beatrice Wood Center for the Arts in Oiai, CA. It included works by such artists as Ray Allen, Frank E. Cummings III, Jean-François Escoulen, Ron Fleming, Giles Gilson, Michael Hosaluk, William Hunter, John Jordan, Ray Key, Philip Moulthrop, Mark Sfirri, and Hans Weissflog. Although several pieces received bids exceeding estimated value, most went for far less—many garnering not much above the opening bid of \$100.

Granted, the auction was not well publicized, but it does provide an indication of the lack of a secondary market for wood art. Many of the patrons who once supported the field are no longer collecting, and many of the new collectors may not be looking for work from the past. The value of these pieces to me is the memory of the enthusiasm, which Dr. Lipton held for every piece he bought.

I also want to note the passing of James Anderson of plywood retailer Anderson International Trading. The former Marine was a strong supporter of this publication and the woodworking community of Southern California. His legacy will live on, through his sons, running the business with the same generosity.

# Garrett Hack

Garrett Hack, a Master Furniture Maker, Educator, Author and Farmer from Thetford, VT., will construct a small hanging cabinet to illustrate the basics of casework and how his case design is adaptable to much more complex pieces.

Cases are a fundamental furniture form, encompassing everything from chests of drawers to cabinets.

> armoires to sideboards. They require the basics of strong case construction along with a whole range of useful furniture making skills to build drawers, doors, shelves, moldings and practical and attractive details.

Garrett will cover such topics as choosing appropriate materials, how to build with solid wood and allow for wood movement, building strong cases with interesting corners and details, the advantages of a face frame, solid case backs, and how to support drawers—and maybe include a secret compartment or two.

Our cabinet will have a door, so Garrett will make one, and explain how

to hang it with butt hinges. For practical reasons and the visual interest, we need some moldings, which he will make with molding planes. Throughout the process, Garrett will discuss efficient ways of working that balance the speed of machines with the accuracy and superior finish of hand tools.

A furniture maker of more than 42 years, Garrett has created his own aesthetic, with designs that push his skills to the next level. He's an in-demand woodworking instructor, teaching classes around the world. Hack has a great love of hand tools of all shapes and sizes and uses them to great effect in everything he builds, sculpting delicate details by eye. Garrett is the former chairman of the New Hampshire Furniture Masters.





Hack is the author of "The Handplane Book" (Taunton Press, 1997) and "Classic Hand Tools" (Taunton Press, 1999), and has been a contributing editor at Fine Woodworking magazine since 1989.

### News and Views from WoodCentral.com by Ellis Walentine

### DOWNSIZE YOUR TABLESAW?

There comes a time in every woodworker's life when it becomes necessary to downsize your shop space, and that means scaling back your machinery as well. No matter what you decide, downsizing is likely to be a radical departure from your woodworking past, and the decisions are going to be tough. Take the tablesaw, for example. Should you try to keep your big cabinet saw, or is there a decent alternative that will fit better in a single-car garage? I put the question out to our visitors recently, and the range of replies was informative vet maddening...

"I looked at just about everything out there and wound up getting the 10" portable worm-drive Skilsaw with the folding base. I've only had it a couple of weeks, but I have been very pleased with it's solid construction and performance."

"Frankly, if it were me, I'd keep my cabinet saw and get a good mobile base. My basement shop is 13' x28', and my Unisaw occupies the prime central spot. When I'm using my planer or doing some other shop operation, the saw gets moved. It's no big deal."

"My garage saw is the Ridgid portable with the folding roll-around stand. When not in use, it takes up maybe three or four square feet of floor space. The miter slots are fine, the fence is fairly accurate (as a belt and suspenders type, I always measure anyway), and it folds/rolls nicely. Against a wall, it takes half the room a cabinet saw would."

"Is any saw smaller in footprint than a Unisaw or Powermatic? On a base, they can be wheeled around as conveniently as any other saw. Most important, they are accurate. Fither will run fine with a 1.5 HP motor on 110 volts."

"I had a tablesaw with a 52" fence. The answer comes down to two options; either swap out or cut down the 52" rail to 30" or get a different table saw with short rails. Unless you are working with ply, 30" is more than adequate. And you can break ply down with a circular saw."

"I have heard good things about the Bosch portable worksite saw with the 'gravity-rise' wheeled stand. The saw is accurate, powerful and takes up little space, with the stand folded up and stood up against a wall."

"Anything less than a Unisaw will not be satisfactory."

"My shop is in a small space, and I have a shaper, compound miter saw, radial-arm saw, 5" jointer, drill press, lathe, band saw, 12" planer. Performax, and a 24" dual drum sander. Oh, and a combo disk and belt sander on the bench and a 10" contractor's saw with 30" Biesemeyer fence. And I just built a racetrack-style poker table. It was like having an aircraft carrier in the shop. All of this requires some 3-dimensional thinking: The Performax parks under the wing of the tablesaw. The top of the planer is an outfeed table for the band saw. The tablesaw is parked 5 ft. inside the garage door; so, with the door open, I can rip a 16-ft. board. The jointer fence serves as a support for the RAS. I open the door to the house to joint anything over about two feet. I have to reach as high as I can

to activate the dust collector. Now, you see why I call working in the shop 'going to the gym.'"

"I would really hate to give up my tablesaw. I would cut the rails down first. Look at cutting them down to the point you can rip at 34 ½", so you can fabricate kitchen cabinet ends. Never know when the urge to re-do the kitchen might strike."

"Lowe's has a 13-amp 10" Delta tablesaw for \$599. It doesn't fold up, but it comes with a rolling base and has a Biesemeyer-style fence."

"I used a DeWalt jobsite saw for a while, remodeling a house. I liked it, and I have heard good things about the Bosch version."

"Another option is to enlarge the shop."

"My son just got a small saw. After looking at reviews of the various portable saws, we determined that the best value for the money was the Ridgid #4512, a 13-amp, 10" saw with a mobile base."

"I like my Bosch fold-up 10" saw. Would not trade mine for anything, except a bigger shop!"

"The Ridgid portable is a great saw. With a Freud Fusion 8" blade, it will do just about all that needs to be done."

"I'd rather have a used American-made saw than a jobsite saw. The Rockwell 9" contractor's table saw fits well in the small shop that I have in the basement. It is about two-thirds the size of a 10" saw. I added a mobile base, a paddle switch, a link belt, dust collection, and am considering buying a Delta fence for it, at what I consider a very reasonable price of \$200."

"The SawStop contractor's saw has some pretty neat features that make changing blade height and tilt really fast and easy. The fence seems accurate enough, and stows in it's own holster when in put-away mode."

"A single-car garage is hardly tiny; in fact, that is more acreage than I have in the part of my shop where woodworking is done. It's way more than our local Cartouche-winner used to build a house full of Period furniture. Pros and other well-organized individuals can work in very small spaces, because they are not trying to make everything in a shop. This also goes for amateurs, who have the sense to specialize in one or a few products or techniques. But if you want to do it all, even if you are pretty ruthless about it, you need a lot more space. I would regard a tablesaw as a specialized device. I have probably a dozen power tools that I would keep before I kept a table saw sepecially a bandsaw.

### WHAT'S NEW

### SAWSTOP LOSES ANTITRUST SUIT

Tablesaw manufacturer **SawStop** may have finally lost its antitrust lawsuit against the other woodworking tool manufacturers, alleging that the companies had colluded to boycott its patented injury-prevention technology.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit did not rule that a boycott did not occur, but rather that the lawsuit was filed beyond the 4-year statute of limitations for antitrust claims. The judges' decision was that the founders of SawStop were aware of the boycott scheme as early as 2002, but did not take legal action until 2014, although making such claims to the public. Defendants in the lawsuit were Black & Decker, Robert Bosch Tool Corp. Rvobi, and Milwaukee Electric Tool Corp.

### **MACKINTOSH ON FIRE, AGAIN**

BREAKING NEWS — As we go to press, there are reports that the Mackintosh Building at the Glasgow School of Art in Scotland is on fire, for the second time in four years. Designed by Charles Rennie Mackintosh, the iconic Scottish landmark has been undergoing restoration, after damage from a fire in 2014. This blaze appears to be more extensive.

### **NEW FORMALDEHYDE RULES**

After years of wrangling, a Federal court ruling allowed new formaldehyde standards to go into effect June 1. These rules prohibit the sale of wood products with "excessive" amounts of formaldehyde. Off-gases are a known carcinogen and cause of respiratory health problems (as exemplified by illnesses suffered by Hurricane Katrina survivors placed in cheaply constructed emergency housing).

In 2010, Congress adopted tougher standards for formaldehyde, and in 2016, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) formulated regulations, reaching a consensus among industry and consumer/environmental groups. Implementation was to begin in December, 2017, but was halted by EPA Administrator Scott Pruitt. In March, a U.S., District Court overruled Pruitt, setting the new implementation date.

North American plywood manufacturers already meet these standards. Mostly affected will be cheap plywood imported from Asia.

### MILWAUKEE'S CORDLESS TABLE SAW

This summer, Milwaukee is delivering its M18 Cordless Table Saw. Though cordless contractor-style saws are not new, this one runs its brushless motor off an 18-volt battery—no more cord, no more need for extra batteries. ### **VOC ED LEADS TO HIGHER GRAD RATES**

A study of Oregon public schools has found that students who take career and technical education classes (CTE) are much more likely to graduate high school on time. For students taking one CTE class, students were nearly 10% more likely to graduate than those who didn't. For those taking multiple CTE classes, 92% were more likely to graduate, compared to an overall state average of 77%.

In 2016, Oregon voters approved a measure to expand educational programs, and many school districts have applied this funding to technical education classes.



### **TOMMY MAC SUES WGBH-TV**

Television woodworking personality **Tommy Mac** is suing WGBH-TV Boston over rights to the title *Rough Cuts*. He accuses the public television station of trademark infringement and profiting from his image in a reboot of the series without him.

Thomas J. MacDonald crafted his woodworking skills as a stometh at North Bennet Street School, and for years, videotaped himself building fine furniture to post on-line as a weekly webcast, The Rough Cut Show. He garnered a dedicated audience, which caught the eye of WGBH. The TV station picked up the show, where it aired for seven years on public television stations

across the country. In late 2016, Tommy's contract was not renewed, ending the series, . . or so he thought.

This Spring, WGBH brought back Rough Cuts for an eighth season, in conjunction with Fine Woodworking magazine and host Tom McLaughlin.

In the lawsuit, Tommy accuses WGBH of exploiting his name, picture, and trademarks. "Defendants are attempting to and have de-

ceived the public into believing that plaintiff MacDonald is the originator of the Defendants' new show and is participating in it, endorsing it and sponsoring it."

It also says that the new show is a "confusingly-similar intentional imitation" of Rough Cut: Woodworking with Tommy Mac and insists that advertisements for the new show have used MacDonald's name, image, and trademark without permission.

Tommy seeks unspecified damages, as well as an injunction to stop using his image and the Rough Cut name. He continues to produce woodworking videos, offered on his website: tommy-mac.us and Facebook.

According to Jack," I made the decision to add Bridge City to the Harvey family of innovative products, because I believe that tools ought to inspire their owners. John and I share the belief that 'Good Enough is NOT Good Enough,' a business philosophy that permeates our entire company. I know there is a perception in America that tools made in China are somehow inferior, and in some cases that is true. We are acutely aware that for Harvey to achieve our corporate objectives, we cannot afford to let anyone down, particularly the current and future customers of Bridge City Tool Works."

John will continue to design "fun stuff" for Harvey, for at least the next two years. And John will head the Harvey quality control department, all to ensure that the legacy of quality continues.

Harvey Industries manufactures industrial quality woodworking machinery sold in more than 100 countries around the world. In North America, Harvey has been an OEM for many of the best-known woodworking brands and currently sells select machinery under its own name.





### From David Marks Studio

### **Questions & Students' Boxes**

by David Marks



David Marks has been a studio furniture maker in Santa Rosa, CA for nearly 40 years and was the host of the popular woodworking television program WoodWorks on the DIY network. He also has been a contributor to Woodworker West. since 2004.

1. Lacquer Over an Oil Finish: For high traffic areas, does it make any sense in spraying a protective lacquer finish, after applying the Linseed and Tung Oil finish. This would be the best of both worlds.

**David's Answer:** Yes, sometimes I will apply lacquer over a hand rubbed oil finish in order to get the depth and beauty that the slow drying oil/varnish blend brings out, while gaining the protective properties of lacquer.

I proceed in the usual manner of sanding the wood to 320 grit or higher, then applying the General Finishes *Seal a Cell* as the first coat. I want to emphasize that you need to really rub hard and get all of the extra finish off of the surface, so that it dries in the wood, not on the wood.

I let the first coat dry overnight in my heated drying room at 75°. The next day, I rub the surface hard with 0000 steel wool. I prefer the Liberon brand, which is more consistent without oil in the steel wool fibers.

After blowing the dust off with compressed air, I apply a coat of General Finishes Arm-R-Seal, which has urethane in it. This finish dries faster, and if the resins start to set up on the surface, I apply a little more oil, which will dissolve the sticky residue allowing me to wipe and buff the surface clean and dry. Once again, I must emphasize the need to rub hard enough to remove all of the finish from the surface, so it appears to be dry. In reality, there is still enough finish there that has soaked into the fibers of the wood to create a soft sheen.

This coat needs to dry for a minimum of 3 days, preferably a week. After that, I will pad on a thin coat of shellac. I have had success mixing my own, or simply using the Zinsser Bulls Eye 100% Wax Free Universal Sanding Sealer. The shellac will bond to any finish, and any finish will bond to the wax free shellac, so it is the perfect intermediate coat to make incompatible finishes compatible.

After the shellac has dried overnight, then I will proceed to the lacquer finish. The primer for lacquer is sanding sealer. Sanding sealer has stearates in it to soften it and make it sand easier.

Sanding sealer should never be applied in thick coats. One or two coats thinned with lacquer thinner is all you need. The sealer helps the lacquer bond better to the surface. I prefer to use a vinyl sanding sealer, which is more water-resistant than regular sanding sealer. Two thins coats should be enough followed by very light sanding with 320 grit paper.

You need to apply the lacquer within a certain time window to get a good bond to the sealer, so make sure you read the directions on the can for best results. I would say as a general rule, apply the lacquer after the vinyl sanding sealer has set for about two hours.

I build all of my coats of lacquer with gloss lacquer, which will give you maximum clarity as well as maximum hardness.

You can get good protection with just a few coats of lacquer, or you can sand it at 320, and keep shooting more coats. The more you sand and shoot, the more

the grain will become filled in. You will be on your way to a "Piano Finish," if you apply 15-20 coats.

The so-called *Piano Finish* refers to a "glass-like" surface. This means shooting no more then 3 coats per day and light sanding in between coats to help fill the pores as well as scuffing the surface so that the solvents can evaporate faster.

Eventually, you will have a smooth finish that will need to harden for two weeks to a month before wet sanding and rubbing out to a mirror reflection.

Lacquer finishes will shrink as they cure, so be advised to test your coats by seeing if you can dent the finish with your fingernail. If you can, then wait until you can't dent the surface with light pressure before going on to the next coat.

Chemists are constantly changing their formulas, so I always recommend doing your test samples on small pieces of wood (I make sample boards 4" wide by 12" long x 1/4" thick). I highly recommend writing your notes on the back and dating each coat that you apply. Be as scientific as possible to help ensure the best results.



## SketchUp: Rules for Success

by David Heim



SketchUp Success for Woodworkers (118 pages, 524.95), by **David Heim** is a useful handbook for making the 3-D design computer software an integral woodworking tool. With a simple set of rules for success, easy-to-understand instructions, helpful screen shots, and step-by-step examples, you will be downloading this free program at breakfast and drawing detailed plans by dinner

David Helm is a trained journalist, who worked for Consumer Reports and Fine Woodworking magatines. At Fine Woodworking, be edited an article by a retired engineer about a certain 3-D design and modeling program, known as SketchUp, and thereafter became a dedicated user.

He has edited three SketchUp books and teaches classes locally in Connecticut, as well as at the traveling Woodworking Shows. And he has posted more than 400 models of traditional and contemporary furniture to the SketchUp database at https://dwarehouse.sketchup.com/.

I began using SketchUp in 2007, and as soon as I saw how this 3-D design program worked and how simple and powerful it was, I put away my T-square and triangle and began drawing plans only on the computer. Then in 2014, I began giving presentations about SketchUp at The Woodworking Shows, where I polished my Rules for Success. Now, I want to share the rules with a larger audience.

Technically, SketchUp is a computer-assisted design (CAD) program. Compared to other CAD programs, SketchUp is simpler, easier to use, and much more intuitive. It's also much less expensive. In other words, it is CAD for the rest of us. I tell my students that you can download SketchUp at breakfast and be drawing cool plans by dinner time. And that isn't much of an exaggeration.

For the past ten years, SketchUp has come in two versions: a free software download, SketchUp Make, intended for personal use, and a paid software download, SketchUp Pro, intended for those who use it in their businesses. Recently, a webbased SketchUp Free version has become available, but with limitations. (Note: SketchUp Make is no longer listed among the products at www.sketchup.coml, however, it still can be downloaded at www.sketchup.coml/download/make). SketchUp Pro, of course, has some added functions, but all three work conceptually the same.

### **Virtual Reality**

There are two important facts to know about SketchUp:

- 1. You are always working in three dimensions.
- You always work in full size. An inch in SketchUp is the same as an inch in real life.

Although you draw shapes in *SketchUp*, it isn't a drawing program like *Adobe Illustrator*. Think of the shapes as virtual boards. You give each piece its length, width, and height and assemble the pieces just as you would real wood in the shop. The result is more than a 3-D drawing of the piece that you plan to build.

You have a model of the real piece, made to exact size, with all the joinery in place. You can even add knobs, hinges, and other hardware—all the details that you need to make the actual construction go smoothly.

Modeling in *SketchUp* brings three advantages to your woodworking:

 Check the joinery. The programs have an X-Ray feature, which allows you to look inside of parts to make sure that dovetail pins and tails fit together snugly and that mortises align with tenons. If anything looks out of whack, you can easily fix it before you begin cutting the actual wood.

- Preview the glue-up. Assembling a piece in the computer serves as a useful dress rehearsal for actual construction. This allows you to mentally walk through the stages of the glue-up, to be sure everything will go smoothly once you are in the shop.
- 3. Generate accurate plans. You can easily adapt the SketchUp model to create measured drawings, as well as full-size patterns and templates. The measured drawings are based on the sizes of the pieces that you created for the model, so you can be sure all the measurements are absolutely accurate. There's also a separate, free SketchUp app that will generate a cut list and cutting diagram.

Although SketchUp is simple and direct, it does come with a learning curve. In order to make the program behave, you need to understand some basic concepts and master some ways to complete a model quickly and accurately. In my book, I elaborate on my Rules for Success.

### **Rules for Success**

- 1. Always work with components. For woodworkers, a component is a virtual board. Like any single piece of wood in your shop, a component is a separate, discrete entity. You can cut, shape, size, copy, and move a component, without affecting any other component in your model. In your shop, after all, cutting one board doesn't make all the other boards shorter. If you don't work in components, you'll just create random lines and shapes.
- Draw once & make as many copies as you need. So much of woodworking involves making multiples: table legs, bookcase shelves, and so on. Duplicates can be rendered accurately and oriented and spaced correctly.
- 3. Keep measuring and moving to a minimum. Don't spend time measuring things that don't need to be measured, and don't move things that don't need to be moved. Draw new components right where they are suppose to go. This speeds your modeling and ensures that parts will be sized accurately and fit together properly.
- 4. Work in SketchUp as you do in the shop. In woodworking, there's a sound logical sequence of steps you need to take you from start to finish. You probably wouldn't build a table from the top down, nor cut crown molding for a bookcase before adding sides, back, and shelves. It's the same in SketchUp.

### The Bottom Line

**Tim Killen**, a retired engineer who makes beautiful period furniture, introduced me to *SketchUp*. He says that the program has totally changed the way he works. Tom will not build anything, no matter how simple, without first making a model and plans in *SketchUp*.


By the time you begin milling lumber and shaping joints, the piece will seem very familiar, because you've virtually constructed it. As a result, you will be able to work faster, and with fewer costly mistakes.

## Profile: Nairi Safaryan

Rose Jewelry Box Boxwood (4<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" h, 9<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" w x 4" d) Nairi Safaryan of Glendale, CA is a self-taught wood sculptor, who takes carving to another level. His eye for beauty and his technical skills combine in pushing the capacity of the materials to create stunning and highly delicate pieces of art. Here is Nairi's story, in his own words:

As a child in Armenia, I always enjoyed working wood. At age 4, my parents gave me a saw, and I proceeded to cut off the wood supports under our dinner table. Luckily my parents were supportive, shrugging it off saying, 'He's learning.'

My favorite hobby was whittling. I always had a knife in hand, carving whatever wood was available. From tree branches, I would make

toys, which my friends would look forward to playing with, and even a pointer for my geometry teacher. I also drew and made sculptures from chalk.

I had wanted to go to an art school, but my parents said it would be better to choose a 'real' profession like engineering. So, I completed my electrical engineering degree from Yerevan Polytechnic Institute and began working for a prestigious company, all the while maintaining carving as my pastime.

My first serious piece of sculpture was of my beloved grandfather, who could build a house by himself. The piece was so realistic that it brought my grandmother to tears for her deceased husband. Over time, I continued to develop both my technical and artistic skills, trying to push the limits of the wood's strength to achieve extraordinary levels of thinness and refinement.

In 1987, I became a member of the Art Fund, which gave me my first opportunity to show my work to the public. That first exhibition



included a vase and a jewelry box. In 1991, I turned professional, deciding to sell at Vernissage, the openair market in Armenia's capital city of Yerevan. I displayed a jewelry box, made from a single block of Pearwood, embellished with finely carved thin vine leaves and naturallooking fruits. Though poorly displayed, it still caught people's attention and was purchased by U.S. Congressman F. James Sensenbrenner, Jr.

I soon gained acknowledgement within the local art community and was invited to participate in two exhibitions at the Yerevan Folk Art Museum. By 1996, I was honored with the title of Folk Master—in recognition as being a Master Woodcarver and my work reflecting a great devotion to the national heritage.

While selling in the market, I met a visiting American, who offered to sell my work in United States. Thereafter, he invited me to come teach and participate in exhibitions (1999 and again in 2002). My style of carving was unlike any other work in those shows, and I won several Best of Show awards. It was very gratifying to find my art appreciated by the American audience, which encouraged me to move my family to the U.S. in 2007 and open Nairi's Art Studio in Glendale, CA.

Unlike most carvers, I choose to work with hardwoods, and unlike sculptors, my work is very detailed. My pieces consist of very thin, paper-like, and fragile elements, which would be impossible to achieve and maintain with softer woods. I still use many of my tools that I brought from Armenia, and when I need something special for a specific application, I make it. My blades need to be very thin and long to achieve the cuts I require.

Inspiration comes from family, culture, and the environment. Each piece is unique; each idea is precious. I may begin by roughing out the form on a lathe, but the majority of the work is meticulous hand work. Some pieces may take several months; others more than a year. People who purchase my work recognize the amount of effort it takes to create and respect of the value of my art.

Among the highlights of my career was being the only American invited carver to participate in last Spring's World Wood Day event in Angkor Wat. Cambodia. Besides collaborating with 110 carvers

from 75 countries, I had the honor of having my work appreciated by **Hun Sen**, the Prime Minister of Cambodia.

However, my greatest satisfaction is having my daughter follow in my footsteps. She used to sit in my lap and watch what I was doing for hours. Today, she creates her own awardwinning pieces. You can see both of our work at: www.woodsymphony.com/nairisafaryan/.



### SHAVINGS & SAWDUST

### WORLD'S OLDEST SCULPTURE

In 1894, Russian gold miners stumbled upon the remains of a 17-foot wooden figure, buried deep in a peat bog on the eastern slope of the Middle Urals. The Shigir Idol, carved from a Larch tree, has stimulated much speculation over the past 100 years, but recent radiocarbon dating has established the age of the totem to be 11,500 years old, created during the early Mesolithic era. It currently resides on display in the Sverdlovsk Regional Museum of Local Lore in Yekaterinburg, Russia.

### **WOOD ALCOHOL COMING TO MARKET?**

Researchers at Japan's Forestry and Forest Products Research Institute have developed an alcoholic beverage from wood, with the taste of alcohol aged in wood barrels. The method involves pulverising wood into a creamy paste and then adding yeast and an enzyme to start the fermentation process. Without the need of heat to decompose the wood, the unique flavors of different species can be preserved. Woods utilized so far are Cedar, Birch, and Cherry. This beverage could be available for sale in three years.

### **WOODEN STICKY TAPE**

Engineers at the **University of Delaware** have developed a novel process to make adhesive tape from wood. They utilize wood lignin, which is a waste material in making paper. As a natural polymer, lignin shares similar structural and materials properties to petroleum-derived polymers, commonly used in adhesives and other consumer products. The wood tape performs comparably to current commercially-available products.

### **ROBOTIC WORKSHOP ASSISTANTS**

The woodshop of the future may go beyond computer-assisted design and computer-assisted manufacturing. Robots may be performing the menial tasks, to leave the craftman more time to design and craft. Engineers at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's (M.I.T.) Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence Laboratory have created a robot-assisted carpentry system.

AutoSaw consists of computer-design software and semiautonomous robots. Users choose among design templates (e.g., chairs, desks, tables) and customize in terms of size and shape. These instructions are sent to small mobile robots to complete the cutting process using a jig saw and chop saw. After cutting, the user then assembles the new piece of furniture. The objective is to reduce the chance of workshop injuries.

In the M.I.T. application, design software directs mobile robots to shuttle lumber to the appropriate tool to be automatically cut to accurate size.

Meanwhile, the engineers at Singapore's Nanyang Technological University (NTU) are tackling the assembly task. Their robots have demonstrated that they can autonomously put together an Ikea chair. They are programmed to differentiate between components and apply appropriate force when assembling parts.
