Small bookcases serve different needs. They can hold books and magazines, plates and goblets, keys or remote controls. Or they can provide a builder with a lovely opportunity for carving and inlay. Join us for this exploration of form and joinery but with great details.

Case construction can be accomplished in many ways. Learn several methods for carcase construc-

tion that are solid and can be decorative. Learn to cut different through and stopped mortise and tenon joints. Discover the absolute joy of a tapered sliding dovetail joint for case construction. Then see how to carve and shape through tenon joints. Whether a tenon is wedged or not, careful chisel work spruces up any bit of exposed joinery. From Gothic peaking to a Greene and Greene pillowed and puffed tenon extending below a cabinet face, there are many ways of shaping joints to make them a vivid part of a design. See how a

simple chisel can be your best carving tool.

Gary will also discuss inlay and carving details that make simple forms stand out. Learn how to carve a simple basket weave design that you create to liven up a case side. Any number of forms or shapes can be used as inlay but there are opportunities as well for curved inlay, sand shading your inlay, and carving it in place. Come to see these techniques in action.

EPOXY FOR JOINERY

A few weeks ago, one of our regular visitors posted that he was considering using some sort of epoxy for a large, complicated glue-up with many mortise-and-tenon (M&T) joints, but that he had never worked with epoxy before and wanted to know more about it before committing to this approach. As usual, our folks responded with a wealth of useful information. Here are some of their offerings...

"If assembly time is an issue, or if joints are in danger of seizing upon assembly, use liquid hide glue. If your joints are sloppy or loose, shim with veneer and then re-size with a shoulder plane."

"I recall using original Titebond for gluing up projects with complex, tight fitting joints, and having it grab before I could get all the clamps on, then having to use hammers and blocks of wood to coax the joints together. The angst one feels in times like that probably takes a year off one's life. So, I started using boatbuilder's epoxy to buy more assembly time. In those days, West System was the best-known brand, but I had some trouble with the calibrated pumps that they use to dispense the right proportions of resin and hardener. Then, I switched to System 3, which I liked better, but I finally settled on FGCI, which is about half the price of the other two and is a 1:1 mix ratio and not all that sensitive to being off a little. I keep clear disposable Solo cups to mix in, and the little

2-oz. cups for small batches. I can just set two cups beside each other and pour equal amounts in each. This epoxy is fairly viscous to begin with, but I keep colloidal silica on hand to mix into it for however thick I want it to be. For veneering, I may want it to be about like latex paint, for M&T joints maybe catsup, or even thicker if there is enough space for it to slowly run out of a joint before it kicks. I suggest using masking tape around the joints during your dry-run fit-up to protect against squeeze out."

"For patching holes and defects with a matching color filler, besides adding the silica, I keep the dust from my belt sander bag in jars from various colors to add to the mix. By themselves, they will darken more than the wood species that it's from, but with the silica a little will do the trick."

"Unlike water-based adhesives, epoxy does not penetrate the cell walls, so it needs a bit of surface texture, or 'tooth,' to grab onto. Epoxy manufacturers recommend thoroughly abrading the surface with 80-grit aluminum oxide paper to provide this texture."

"Epoxy likes a thicker glue line, so I don't use if for edge gluing. It also acts like a lubricant for the joints during assembly, so you may be surprised that it goes together easier than your dry-run."

"The one mistake you can make is not mixing the epoxy thoroughly enough. Any unmixed resin in the mix will never harden, so mix it well. I stir vigorously, rotating the cup in my hand and making a conscious effort to scrape the sides and bottom of the container, as well as occasionally scraping the stick off on the lip. Epoxy cures faster at higher temperatures, so you can gain lots of open time when working large projects if you keep it cool, then warm it up after assembly. And it does need to be warmed up. In cool weather, after measuring into my mixing cup, I move to my sink and mix while the hot water is flowing over and around the outside while I rotate the tilted cup. When it feels warm, I head out to the project and start spreading. The mixing stick becomes a good applicator for M&T joints. Also, since it cures slowly, you can wait until the cure is about like leather, and trim it off with a knife or chisel.

"Don't mix more than you can spread before it starts to generate it's own heat. If you have more than about 1/2" of depth in your container, it can heat up fast and melt the cup you mixed in. This is not an issue after it's been spread out thin. So, mixing a second or third batch after spreading the first is less of an issue than having more mixed than you can get spread before it heats up. It may not kick for 6 hours after spreading out, and finding you need to adjust something well after you thought you were done isn't an issue. You can move a part as long as the epoxy is liquid enough, and it will still bond the other side as long as they touch."

"My go-to for all joinery is liquid hide glue, for four reasons: Most importantly, it is reversible, which is essential when you need to make repairs; secondly, for multiple joints, it has a longer open time; thirdly, liquid hide glue will clean up in water and does not affect finishes; and fourthly, new hide glue goes directly on old hide glue. That doesn't work well with yellow or white glues. I do not use epoxy much, except as a filler of holes when tinted to match the wood."

"The biggest advantage of epoxy over other glues is that it is gap-filling. I would rather have a well-made joint than fill one, but this can be an advantage where the joinery is not easily fine-tuned. It is also possible to undo a hide-glue joint with heat, but I am not sure whether this is possible with epoxy. For edge-gluing, I like Titebond III. Liquid hide glue takes too long, and I'm not sure whether it is as strong as Titebond for this task."

"I have used epoxy for M&T joints. It has excellent gap filing properties, and I thicken it with fine sander dust if necessary. I also like the long open time of the one-hour variety."

"My local woodworking club received a briefing on adhesives a couple years ago from the director of research at Franklin, the manufacturer of Titebond and their liquid hide glue. When the subject of glue for M&T joints came up, he recommended the use of epoxy. I found this unusual, because Franklin does not have an epoxy product. His reasoning was based, I believe, on the characteristic of PVA glues, and even liquid hide glue to a lesser extent, to lock up and resist further movement of an M&T joint if there is a time delay from when the tenon is pushed into the mortise and when it is attempted to be fully seated. I have experienced this issue with the assembly of the undercarriage of a Windsor chair when ten M&T joints need to be assembled. Because of the need to not fully seat all the stretcher-leg joints before driving the four legs into the seat, these joints have tendency to lock up requiring the use of persuasion with a hammer. I have gone to epoxy for these joints guite successfully."

"As epoxy cures, it can produce a surface contaminant called amine blush. The following article explains amine blush and how to deal with it: www.epoxycraft.com/amine-blush-what-you-need-to-know/ I'm told that FGCI epoxy doesn't exude this waxy amine blush."

"Amines are one class of hardeners. They react with air to turn dark, eventually black. I have some that is 10+ years old, and it has significantly degraded, has become very slow to set, and likely does not set to make a strong material anymore. A insignificant tiny amount of degradation will turn the hardener dark. I am not sure one can tell if it has degraded to where it should not be used by visual inspection."

"Another interesting thing about epoxy is that more epoxy can be added to an earlier mix; they are supposed to crosslink as long as the first isn't cured."

"I don't understand why epoxy manufacturers suggest roughing the surfaces with sandpaper. Scratching makes vees. How does a material flowing into a vee 'key' into a vee? Scratching is going to increase surface area, but the projected surface area, which determines tension strength, is the same scratched or not. Scratching will likely improve shear strength on something not porous. Scratching wood is just going to make a weak surface layer of torn wood fibers. Further to my point, I have watched a glass artist glue polished pieces of glass together with an epoxy, demonstrating that adhesion, as scientifically defined, has noting to do with 'keying.' It relies entirely on the liquid adhesive wetting the surfaces being bonded. The smoother, the better. The only thing that I can think of is that removing a layer that interferes with forming a strong bond may be required of some material. Sanding would accomplish this task."

"Using epoxy adhesive on materials with different coefficients of expansion—e.g., wood and metal—may cause a shear problem for the joint. The only epoxy joint failure that I've had was in joining a levered clamp with a steel base to the plywood surface of a telescope platform. On the first cold viewing night, the epoxy joint failed at the epoxy/steel interface. I believe the steel must have contracted more than the plywood in the chilly temperature and sheared right off the relatively immobile epoxy/plywood interface."

Gilding, Patination & Questions

Gilding & Chemical Patinations: What is it and What Can You Achieve?

We have talked about gilding and patinations frequently in this space, but some of you may not truly understand the procedure. Gilding involves laying very thin layers of metal leaf on a surface of a workpiece. Most people are familiar with gold leaf, but other metals are available in leaf form. Because patination involves tarnishing or oxidizing the metal, genuine gold is not used because it resists tarnish. Genuine gold can be used for a contrasting accent; it will not oxidize to create a patina. Metals appropriate for patination include copper, silver, and Dutch metal leaf (*aka* composition gold), which is gold in color.

Chemical patinas are achieved by oxidizing the metal leaf with mild acids. Patina chemicals are mild acids that will change the color of metal leaf (silver, copper, and Dutch metal aka composition gold). The chemicals may be applied with a brush, sea sponge, spray bottle, or rag. The intensity of the color may be controlled by how much and how long the acid is applied

The applications and effects you can achieve with the gilding and chemical patination techniques—presented in our 3-day hands on classes in July and December)—are almost limitless.

Because the processes that you will learn can be applied to any surface that will accept paint, you can apply metal leaf with a chemical patina to wood, metal, paper, ceramics, glass, leather, even plastics. Examples of student work are shown to the left, and a video on how I use these techniques can be seen at: www.youtube. com/watch?v=0nUkskNZ3Zg&feature=youtu.be/.

If you are a woodworker, wood turner, jeweler, ceramicist, sculptor, or blacksmith—to name just a few disciplines, you will take home some very creative and innovative techniques to enhance your work and increase your marketability.

Now, time for some questions. . .

1. **Repairing Cracks Before Applying the Finish:** I am repairing cracks in a Bubinga table top. I've got the top sanded down to 320 grit and am very pleased with it. I've been trying both gloss and satin polyurethane on extra Bubinga, but I am not quite ready to seal the real top, as I need to get a couple more coats of the satin on in order to compare it with the gloss.

HOWEVER, two small cracks have appeared back here in my shop. I've turned the thermostat in my shop down to 62° (was at 68°) to see if that helps it close up. Facing the rounded end of the top, one is about 7" long and about $\frac{5}{1000}$ " wide starting about 4" in from the left side at the back. The other is about 2" long and about the same width starting about 4" in from the left side just after the curve starts. They aren't part of one long crack as there is 20" in between.

Should I just go ahead and seal the top (I still have to cut it to length) and let the poly seal the cracks or should I try a glue route? Bill

David's Answer: I think I would proceed with the cyanoacryllate glue (the modern version of "crazy glue"). I would use a combination of the "thin CA glue" and "medium CA glue". If you run a thin bead of the thin glue into the cracks, it will wick in by capillary action. Often times, the thin stuff will soak in and disappear, since it is as thin as water. Then, you can run a bead of the medium glue on top of it, and being thicker, it will start to fill in the cracks.

Try it without using the accelerator. The accelerator will cause it to set up within seconds. If you do not use the accelerator, then it has more time to soak in and absorb, and eventually it will harden. You might want to let it set overnight.

If this was a light colored wood and you were using it on end grain, I would say to seal the wood first with a coat of shellac to avoid staining the wood. Since this is on dark Bubinga and you are using it on long grain, I do not perceive any problem with discoloring the wood. I predict it will soak in, harden up, and stabilize the cracks. If you let it set overnight, and come back the next day, you will see a hardened bead of glue over the cracks. At this point, you will need to level it with a scraper, and sand it up to 320 grit to blend it with the surrounding area.

If your scrapers are not cutting well, you could always take a hard wood block that has been flattened on the jointer, say something 6" long by 3" wide and double stick tape a piece of 120 grit sandpaper to it. This should work pretty well to flatten any excess glue and then you can proceed to sand everything to 320 grit.

In regards to the finish: if you were to put a coat of polyurethane on it first, let it cure and then feed some CA glue into the cracks—that would work. Although when it came time to level the glue, you would most likely be sanding through the polyurethane. That would be OK because you could always put another coat of polyurethane on top of that. My thought is that knowing that it is Bubinga and it is long grain that you are dealing with, it would probably be easier to fill it with CA glue first, level it, sand it, and then proceed with the finishing steps.

Very important point here: When it comes time to apply the polyurethane, make sure the room is warm, preferably around 75°. If the room is cold, the finish will have difficulties drying and if you get any humidity or moisture in the finish, you will lose the clarity of the finish.

2. Turning a Large Disc: When you turn those very large disks, do you turn the headstock around so that it's back side is to the rest of the lathe? I don't see how to do it any other way and from the picture you sent me it looks as though that is how you are doing it. Stephanie

David's Answer: In terms of my discs, I mount them on a 6" heavy cast iron faceplate and thread them on to the out board spindle of my lathe's headstock.



Here is a photo of a large plywood disc that was glued up and ready to be turned on the outboard of my Oneway lathe. The photo below shows the 6" heavy cast iron faceplate on the back of the workpiece.



As I turn the disc, notice the black floor stand.

It was custom made for me by a local welder (he charged me \$500.00). It is the same height as my lathe's bed.




Rather then opt for the Oneway extension (which is bolted on to the lathe), I decided to have a stand made to which I can attach my banjo and tool rest. This is movable, so I'll drag it to any position I need to accomplish a task.

Tools & Techniques

Reinforcing Butt Joints

by Marc Spagnuolo



Marc Spagnuolo is known as the Wood Whisperer. In his new book, Essential Joinery: The Fundamental Techniques Every Woodworker Should Know, Marc explores a collection of essential joinery skills in an illustrated step-by-step manner. Rather than working solely by hand or machine, he teaches woodworkers how to choose the most sensible joinery method for the task at hand, while providing additional techniques and styles for each joint. He also provides insights not found in other books on this subject.

This essay, adapted from Essential Joinery with the publisher's permission, explores various options at the basic joinery level, before the book addresses the more advanced techniques, including dadoes, mortise and tenons, half-laps and bridles, and dovetails.

In its simplest form, joinery is nothing more than a method for attaching one piece of wood to another. There's no more fundamental example of that than the humble 90° butt joint, in which the end-grain of one piece is to be attached to the face or edge of another. Similarly, a miter joint is attaching the end grains of two pieces at a 45° angle.

It's important to note that a simple glued butt joint is inherently weak. The end grain will soak up most of the glue, rendering the joint ineffective. This is why we use reinforcement methods to strengthen these types of joints. Here are some reinforcing joinery alternatives, which are further described in step-by-step detail in Essential Joinery.

SCREWS


One of the most accessible ways to reinforce a basic 90° glued butt joint is to add screws. This can be accomplished by drilling through

the side of one piece into the end grain of the second piece (right) and driving a screw into the hole. If visible, the holes should be arranged to be visually pleasing and be covered with wood plugs.



In cabinetmaking, pocket screws are often used in frame

tach the pieces (below).



DOWELS

Another option is dowel joinery. Holes are drilled on both workpieces and premade dowels are inserted with glue. Dowels have the additional benefit of being completely hidden. There are many dowel jigs on the market to facilitate drilling, but the self-centering dowel jigs are the most useful.

Simply align the desired hole size of the jig to the marked locations, secure the jig, and drill (right). The blue tape wrapped around the drill bit serves as a depth stop.





With the holes drilled, insert the dowels, with glue, into each hole and assemble adjoining pieces (left).

BISCUITS


Biscuits are compressed oval-shaped wafers (made of Beech or particle board) that can be inserted into slots cut into each adjoining piece. There are several biscuit systems on the market. The biscuit joiner cuts corresponding oval slots into adjoining workpieces (right).



The biscuits, with glue, are inserted and pieces are attached (left).

For some applications, a single biscuit just doesn't seem strong enough, so two biscuits are added to strengthen the joint.



SPLINES

Miter joints are essentially butt joints that are cut on a 45° angle. Since butt joints are not very strong with glue alone, miter joints are often reinforced for the sake of durability. Similar to previous the methods, splines are small strips of wood that help keep the joints aligned and lend additional strength. They are inserted into slots cut in the corners of adjoining pieces, before assembly. The slots can be cut using a tall fence or tenoning jig on a tablesaw (right), or a slot cutting bit on a router table (below).






DOMINOES

A Domino joiner works in the same way as a biscuit joiner. The only difference is that the biscuits are replaced with loose tenons called Dominoes. The Domino joiner cuts centered mortises in the adjoining pieces (left) and the Domino tenons, with glue, are inserted into the corresponding mortises (below).







The spline stock is milled to thickness and cut to size, with the grain running perpendicular to the joint. It, then, can be inserted, with glue, into the corresponding slots of the adjoining pieces (below).



TIP: To assist in glue-up, triangle angled cauls can be glued to either side of the mitered corner, to which to attach a clamp. A layer of blue tape between the frame and the blocks prevent tear-out when removing the cauls.

KEYS

While splines are cut in the mitered pieces before glueup, keys are cut into the miter joints in the corners of a frame after the joint is glued-up. In this case, the slot across the center of the glued corner can be cut on a tablesaw, with the workpiece clamped onto a tenoning jig (right).

A key can be cut and milled to size for insertion into the slot (below).



GOING BEYOND THE BASICS

In the end, how much effort that you put into your joinery is completely up to you. There's nothing wrong with butt joints, biscuits, and pocket screws. As long as you're making things that you're happy with, you have my full support and respect. I do encourage all woodworkers to explore new and improved ways of doing things, including better joinery.

If you're like me when I started, you're probably a little intimidated by all of the terminology and options in the world of joinery. Classic joinery texts are informative and exhaustive, but also overwhelming and sometimes short on details. With Essential Joinery, my goal is to demystify joinery by distilling the topics down to the most useful joints in the craft, in a step-by-step fashion showing various ways to get the job done.

I truly believe that you can master and the more advanced techniques to make just about any piece of furniture. Now, let's head to the shop and make some joinery.



After the glue is dry, use a flush trim saw to trim away the excess stock (right).





Using a contrasting wood for the key results in a beautiful decorative element, in addition to reinforcing the joint (below). Or for a less visible feature, use the same species of wood as the frame.





Laural Dresser Redwood burl (32" h, 72" w, 20" d) Scott Grove of Rochester, NY is a third-generation artist. Spanning 30 years, his body of work includes woodwork and furniture featuring highly figured and radiant veneers, trompe l'oeil carvings, and gem inlays; fiberglass and steel sculptures; architectural reproductions; play spaces; photography; paintings; and much more. While his work is elegant and sophisticated, there is a hint of whimsey that beckons a sense of wonder and a desire to touch each piece. Here is Scott's story, in his words:

I come from a family of artists and designers, so art has been a part of my life since an early age. As a boy, I played with crayons, markers, pencils, pastels, wire, string, feathers, bones; I built forts with rocks and wood; I drew, I sculpted, I created; I turned everything I could get my hands on into something else. I grew up in a small town along the Hudson River, about an hour north of New York City, and as a kid, it was a thrill to discover the driftwood, shells, bits of glass, and other materials that could be transformed into something new and creative.

After high school, I enrolled at the Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT). While the initial draw was photography, I found myself in a dark room all day and realized that I didn't want to do that. My final degree was in environmental design with a minor in sculpture, which provided the latitude to take a broad spectrum of design courses.

An interesting tidbit about RIT: it's one of the largest juggling communities in the world, and I learned highlevel juggling, like juggling fire, as well as clowning. On weekends, I would juggle and clown; it was fun and good money. I was good enough to be accepted by Ringling Bros., but after discovering that you do the same act nine shows a week, ten months a year, I declined. Not having creative freedom was a deal breaker, but it confirmed that I need fun to be part of anything I do, whether it's in furniture design, teaching a class, or giving a talk.

After RIT, I met Wendell Castle and discovered

his highly-figured veneer furniture. Two things happened at that moment. One, I felt validated. I had been dabbling in sculptural furniture. After finding sculpture—by itself hard to sell, I decided to put a piece of glass on a sculptural piece... and now I had a coffee table. I felt like I invented sliced bread, but of course Wendell had been doing this

was doing. Two, I saw his highly figured veneer—rare, Curly Redwood—and it took my breath away. It was a "wow" moment. I knew that I wanted to learn everything possible about veneer, which ultimately became the focus of my work. I like to create pieces that make you go "wow" and want to touch it. My relationship with Wendell eventually came full circle: he first inspired me and, years later, I became his studio director and ran his shop for a time.

Since I'm self-taught in veneer and a little defiant, I

for 20 years already. His work simply validated what I

Since I'm self-taught in veneer and a little defiant, I questioned while I learned and tried things. When they say you have to book match, I'd ask, 'why?' So, I developed my own techniques of asymmetrical matching and the spiral match (as seen in *Laural* on the opposite page). My wavy contour seam technique came about after learning the double-bevel cut on a scroll saw from **Silas Kopf.** From there, I developed my extreme compound veneering technique. I took a mold of a nude woman and veneered her torso (right), and the piece won a *Veneer Tech Craftsman's Challenge Award* in 2012.

Many of the techniques have taken years to develop. Some of our textures are done with chisels; some with grinders or chainsaw. I do not limit myself. I will try whatever I can get my hands on. The results are unique for each piece, something that a machine can not duplicate. A majority of my pieces are coated with a copper-based solution, and then we build up a polychrome finish of stains, glazes, and chemicals that react with the copper to create a finish of real depth and a metallic glow (as seen on *X Wife's Desk* below).

I've always been interested in the business-side, dating back to my summers as a student designing and building decks. After graduating RIT, I launched a millwork, cabinetry, and renovation business, as well as a second company specializing in architectural reproductions from fiberglass. I learned everything I could about business, some of it from customers who mentored me. Knowing marketing and sales helped when I made the jump from

making sculptural furniture on the side to displaying at national furniture shows. I enjoy sharing knowledge, so I teach sales and marketing, in addition to veneering techniques.

I want my pieces to spark curiosity and a desire to know more not only about the finished piece but the materials that were used. I want my pieces to pull you in... to tempt you to touch them for a better understanding of the surface and the texture.

SHAVINGS & SAWDUST

WOODWORK AT THE VENICE BIENNALE 2019

The 58th International Art Exhibition, Venice Biennale 2019, opened May 11 and runs thru Nov. 24, throughout Venice, Italy. The festival consists of 89 national pavilions, 21 collateral events, and 79 invited artist exhibitions. The theme is May You Live In Interesting Times, the inventive English translation of a Chinese curse. And many of the works exhibited embody interpretations of current political issues. Here are three examples in which wood was the primary media.

At the U.S. Pavilion, Martin Puryear addresses the topic of freedom in Liberty/Libertà. The exhibit begins outside (right), where he constructed Swallowed Sun—a monumental wooden lattice Southern Yellow Pine screen in a dome-like pattern—in front of the Monticello-style neoclassicaldesigned building. Inside are sculptural works, mostly of wood, related to slavery, migration, and the fight for independence.

Los Angeles-based, Hong Kong-born artist Shirley Tse created a haphazard barricade for the Hong Kong Pavilion. The artwork, composed of wood turned spindles, runs from room-to-room throughout the entire building. Called Negotiated Differences, each turned component is connected to an unrelated part, to represent the yearning for the screaming divisiveness to be replaced by reasonable compromises and strength that lies in differences.

The Carpenters Workshop Gallery, in the Grand Canal's Galleria Giorgio Franchetti alla Ca'd'Oro, hosts 21 designers for its Dysfunctional exhibition. Virgil Abloh addresses climate change and rising sea levels with furniture pieces that are sinking—needing shims to remain level (below).


