few weeks before we went to press with this issue, my family and I embarked on a good old-fashioned road trip. We've typically been "get-where-we're-going-as-fastas-we-can" people, but this time, we wanted to take it slow and enjoy the ride.

From our Virginia home, we meandered through the Blue Ridge to Asheville, North Carolina, to tour the Biltmore Estate, which, at 178,926 square feet, is the largest privately owned home in the United States. Next, we headed to Charleston, South Carolina, for a little lesson in Civil War history and antebellum architecture. Our journey then took us even farther south to Sea World in Orlando, Florida, where my 12-year-old daughter swam with a 2,000-pound dolphin, effectively checking yet another item off of her bucket list (yes, she really has one). From there we headed east to the Space Coast and a riveting tour of Kennedy Space Center, where rockets launch and imagination soars. After a much needed day of total relaxation on Cocoa Beach, we headed home. In all, our trusty Jeep took us nearly 2,100 miles in eight days.

Not only did each stop entertain and delight my family, it taught me a little something about construction. At Biltmore, I observed how even a mega-mansion incorporates intimate, cozy spaces to make it livable. In Charleston, I learned how you site a house can make all the difference in how it performs (piazzas and sleeping porches made the area's intense heat and humidity tolerable pre-air conditioning). Sea World emphasized how a natural environment helps us thrive, and even the rockets at Kennedy held a building lesson: They displayed humankind's infinite capacity not only to dream, but to design and build the vehicles that make achieving the seemingly impossible, possible.

For all the things I learned along our trek, the most important lesson was this: Life really is a journey, not a destination. Call it cliché if you like, but some of the most memorable parts of our trip were playing the license plate game (and desperately trying to be the first to spot the illusive Hawaii plate), laughing over silly things we spied along our route and, in short, reconnecting with my family. In our technology-driven society that moves faster than we can keep up with it, it's a gift to take your time, look around and enjoy the ride. And that's a lesson I won't soon forget.














ABOVE: The "Leopard Diva" is a great gift idea for the sophisticate in your life.

RIGHT: Wanda's "Weekend at the Camp."




But of course Wanda has quite the assortment of "girly" books, too, ranging from fun faux fur to sophisticated leopard print. "There's not much call for dressing up in Maine, so I like to dress my books up with creative designs instead," she explains with a laugh.

The books, themselves, are encased in a simple, flat fabric, but it's the protective jackets that really set her journals apart. Adorned with

bow ties, buttons or clasps (depending upon the style), every element is fully functional. "When I create the designs, I try to think in the same terms as coordinating your clothes," Wanda says. "In some cases, the cover and the coat fabric match. For others, colors or patterns coordinate with each other. I use both new and repurposed material, like vintage denim."

Wanda's versatile books can be anything



you want them to be, from simple daily diaries, to scrapbooks for photos and memorabilia, to guestbooks where visitors to your log cabin can record their experiences during their stay. Recently, Wanda launched a collection of personalized recipe notebooks to keep her customers' culinary masterpieces organized.

Regardless of the purpose, there's something to be said for doing things the old-fashioned way. "Not everything can or should be put online," Wanda says. "I hope my journals inspire people to pick up a pen and record their experiences and memories for themselves as well as for future generations." L

Relationships, accountability and service lie at the heart of whom you should hire to oversee the construction of your log home.

n the world of custom log home construction, there's a question that comes up time and again: "Should I hire a builder or a general contractor to construct my home?"

It's a valid question, but not one with a clear-cut answer.

There is an extremely fine line between a "general contractor" (GC) and a "builder." Both should be licensed by the state(s) in which they operate and work. That should be a given. In fact, in most states, a general contractor's license is required for builders as well as those who are solely GCs. The distinction can be confusing for the consumer, but there are a few subtleties that should be understood.

Often, the definition between the two depends a lot on where you live in the country. In some areas, a GC and a builder are one and

the same. That's how it is in my home state of Tennessee. I actually hold a general contractor's license myself; however, I qualify myself as a "builder" and here's why:

For the most part, when people are weighing whether they should hire a GC or a builder, the biggest difference lies in the relationships between that person and the trade contractors.

A GC typically is an individual who manages an assortment of independent trades, including builders and framers. He doesn't necessarily have his own crew working under his umbrella full time. Instead, a GC will take on the project; submit the plans to multiple construction and trade contractors for bid; and select his team based on quality, value and service. Once the team is assembled, he is responsible for scheduling and managing those individuals throughout the entire pro-

cess, though he typically will deploy a site supervisor to oversee daily activities on site.

A builder works in a similar way, except a builder typically has his own crew. He'll personally employ most of the people who will work on the job site. Depending on the size of his business, the trade contractors he may not have in-house are specialists like electricians or HVAC pros, but he often has trusted partners in these areas with whom he frequently works. And more often than not, you'll see a builder participating in construction activities on the site (i.e., swinging the hammer) and personally overseeing the work being done by the team.

There's a perception that a builder has a closer personal relationship with a client than does a GC, and this can play out in myriad ways.

For example, due to the nature of his man-

agerial role, a GC will build precisely what is laid out on the plan without question. A builder, however, may look at a plan and see ways to improve it or save money on design or materials, and then convey those suggestions to you. For most builders, a project is as much a reflection of him and his talents as it is the of owner's vision. This is not to suggest that GCs don't take pride in their work — they absolutely do! However, the relationship with a builder typically is a more intimate experience. It boils down to a difference in philosophy.

But because a builder is more hands-on (in most cases), he can't take on as many projects simultaneously as a GC can. A GC typically works on volume versus a builder who may sign on for one or two houses at a time. This could create a price disparity between the two, but one option may not be significantly less ABOVE: The builder/client relationship usually is a more intimate one, and you'll often find your builder personally engaged in daily construction activities.

expensive than the other. Construction costs are more reliant upon the local labor market, as well as the size, materials and complexity of the home.

As you're factoring cost into the equation, keep in mind that when you're making an investment as large as a custom log home, you're not buying on price alone. You need to consider service and what type of relationship you want to have with the person who is responsible for the construction of your home. This, combined with checking references and examining their work firsthand, will help you make the person-





Sentimental Journey







ife, it is said, is a series of choices, with only the benefit of hindsight to gauge your success. When my wife, Amanda, and I set off on our journey to design and build our dream log home, we knew we were making one of the biggest choices of our lives — one with the most long-lasting impact to our family. Now that our house is done (and has been chronicled in Log Home Living for the past year-anda-half), we are finally living in our dream. It's nice to be able to take a breath and look back at the myriad choices we made along the way and see what everyone thinks of the home we've built together.

One of the things I hear most from visitors as they see our home from the outside is, "This place is huge!" I won't disagree that it's larger than average house and that the facade it presents to those coming up the driveway or viewing from across the valley may even make it feel imposing. But a major part of our design principle was to create an exterior that makes a statement, with large exposed timbers and truss work, striking rooflines with generous overhangs and an angled garage that visually extends the home's size.

The irony is that for us as a family, and for most of those same visitors once they step





inside our home, is that it's very cozy and has a lot of the small-home feel that belies its larger-than-life exterior. It's here that the logs make all the difference, with their warm honey-toned finish and gracefully flared butt ends. There's warmth to wood that doesn't exist with drywall or other typical home finishes.


Our home's layout also fosters togetherness. The kitchen, great room, dining room and bar area all flow together better than even Amanda and I had hoped.

"I love my kitchen," Amanda says time and again. "It's big enough to cook in while the kids run around, color at the island, watch iPads at the table or 'help' me cook. In our last kitchen, we were always stepping all over ourselves. Now I feel like I can breathe."

The kitchen island is the most striking part of the room's design, and Amanda fought hard to keep it the size that it is. There was a lot of concern from many folks, myself included, that it would be too big and have unusable space, but Amanda was adamant it stay as drawn. It was definitely the right decision for us, and it has worked out fantastic as a spot for the kids to eat and do school activities, as well as for us to set up buffets for dinner parties.

While the kitchen is where most of life happens, it is the great room that's the true centerpiece of our home, because it's the part with the awesome log truss work that draws the most astonishment from our guests. A lot of planning went into the design of the core of







our house. I had a very clear vision of what I wanted to see when I walked in the front door and faced the great room: logs, a grand stone fireplace and a view of outside through a wall of windows. And that's exactly what I have.

The wood-burning fireplace is the room's anchor, capped by a one-of-a-kind burled redwood mantel crafted by Redwood Burl in California. The adjoining log staircase makes its own statement and doubles as a fun conversation piece. Inspired from the pages of *Log*

Home Living, the hand-hewn "canoed" treads crafted of the same lodgepole pine as the other timbers were assembled into ash stringers by a local stair craftsman and our builder. For all its unique structural components, it's the view that really makes the room, though, and the oversized windows frame some of the most beautiful sunsets in New Jersey. Amanda says, "With all these windows, it's like being outside all the time, and it's just so relaxing to sit and watch the deer walk by."

The smallest members of the family have their own points of view, too. All three, of course, love their rooms. Outfitted with bunk beds in each space, it's where they enjoy playing with toys and an impromptu game of hide-and-seek. Though our son, Shane, admits, "The kitchen is pretty cool, too. There's a lot of room ... and a lot of hiding places." When asked to name her favorite space in the home, Molly was non-committal, "I love everything, because it's soooo cool!" For as much arguing as I do with





my 4-year-old daughter, I find it difficult to find flaw with that statement.

For those that have followed our journey with us, I've tried to share my opinions of things as we have moved along, and if I were to share all my favorite aspects of our house, we might need a book instead of a magazine article! One late addition I can share since the last "Log Home Journey" installment is that my great room bar has quickly turned into one of my favorite spaces in the house. The cabinets are from the same Omega line as those in the kitchen, albeit a different style. I absolutely love the Cygnus quartzite countertop with its rustic chiseled edge. It was a frontrunner for our kitchen, but lost out because of its darker color. I quickly revisited it when the bar opportunity came up. As an Irishman, having my own "Murphy's Bar" is, in the words of

Garden Variety

Backyard greenhouses can boost your gardening efforts all year-round.

nyone who's ever tried to navigate stacks of pots, soil, trowels, watering cans and other gardening paraphernalia knows how quickly a garage or basement can turn into an unworkable space for plant cultivation or anything else (like parking your car). Fortunately, there's a simple solution: Build a backyard greenhouse.

Not only will a greenhouse give you the storage space you need, it also can help you get a jump on seedlings for the outdoor growing season. Plus, if you're up for keeping it heated, you can have fresh veggies in the dead of winter or grow plants that aren't usually viable in your climate.

Here are some factors to keep in mind if you're considering a backyard greenhouse:

ZONING AND TAXES

Most likely, your greenhouse will be an immoveable structure, unless you opt for a small, shed-like space. Because of that, check with your local zoning official about what permits you'll need (if any), what's allowed in terms of square footage and how it might affect your property taxes.

LOCATION

You'll want your greenhouse to be convenient, especially if you're growing in a cold climate and don't want a long trek through the snow. Some people find the best solution is a lean-to greenhouse that's attached to a house or garage. Others use it as a landscape focal point, with winding pathways leading to the structure. Whichever option you prefer, be sure to place the greenhouse near a water source (and protect your log walls).

GROWING SPACE

This is one area where it may be helpful to overestimate your needs. Because a greenhouse could potentially be in place for decades, you have to consider how you might be expanding your gardening efforts. Give yourself plenty of growing area, as well as room to move around.

POWER, HEAT & WATER

The most efficient tactic for greenhouses is running separate electrical lines to the structure. Although this may be an investment upfront, you'll appreciate it for powering lights and heaters. If you want to get really professional with your backyard greenhouse, consider installing a misting system. They're surprisingly affordable, incredibly convenient and quite effective for helping plants thrive.

VENTILATION

Proper ventilation may be the single most important factor of greenhouse gardening. Every greenhouse needs to breathe, either in the form of fans or windows/panels that can be opened to allow air inside. Incorporating a good ventilation system that employs exhaust shutters and/or roof vents along with an exhaust fan and a quality evaporative cooler will significantly cut down the risk for plant disease, rot and mold.

CONSTRUCTION

Unless you have very specific shelving, light placement and framing needs, it's likely that you can make your greenhouse build more affordable by ordering a kit. These have come a long way in the past 10 years, and now there are many easy-to-assemble options that you can order online. They can range in price from \$800 to over \$5,000 depending on size and materials. But hiring local builders can be an equally affordable option, depending on where you live. Either way, make sure your flooring material is durable and offers good drainage to ensure your backyard greenhouse will be on solid ground for years to come.

BELOW: Unless you have very specific needs that require a customized build, you likely can get by with a greenhouse kit. They're affordable and easy for the DIYer to assemble.

Country Craftsman

Step inside a Tennessee timber frame where a vision became a forever home

ynn and Chris Langer's new timber frame home is a stunning example of I how a vision becomes a forever home.

"I guess you'd call what we wanted a mountain-style, arts-and-crafts bungalow," says Lynn, explaining that their idea had been to create the feel of the early 20th century Craftsman architecture frequently seen in Adirondack mountain lodges.

Originally from New England, the Langers retired to Tennessee's Upper Cumberland region after finding land they liked online. They'd owned a timber frame in Connecticut, so they approached the design of their new home with a clear vision.

"It had to have a great room with high ceilings, an open floor plan and a cozy kitchen and dining room," Lynn says. "We found Honest Abe, and now we have exactly what we wanted."

Lynn said that she and Chris were drawn to Honest Abe Log Homes, which has been designing and manufacturing log and timber frame homes since 1979, because of its reputation in the industry. The fact that Honest Abe's design team can easily convert any plan to a timber frame coupled with the caliber of Honest Abe's products convinced the Langers that the Tennesseebased company was a perfect fit for their project.

"We were very familiar with post-andbeam construction, and right away we realized this was quality work," Lynn recalled from her first visit to Honest Abe's headquarters in Moss, Tennessee. "The wood was planed to a smooth finish, and the Douglas fir timbers were nice and straight with a stylish chamfer."

Working with the Cookeville Honest Abe Log Homes sales team, Greg and Melissa Watson and Ed White, the Langers launched their design process in the spring of 2015.

The Navajo plan from the company's Legacy Collection was almost exactly what the Langers had in mind, but they wanted to customize it on both the interior and exterior. Award-winning designer Michael Hix of Honest Abe's in-house design and drafting department transformed the basic plan to match their concept.

For instance, a first floor guest room shown on the Navajo plan was repurposed into a full-time office, but placement of a Murphy bed in the office quickly converts it to a room for hosting guests like the couple's two grown sons, both city dwellers, who Lynn says love to "come for a rest in the country."

With the house located on 43 acres of rural land fronting the Caney Fork River in White County, Tennessee, the Langers wanted a comfortable spot for experiencing the seasons outdoors. Working with Honest Abe's design team, they created a 16-by-18-foot outdoor room under a large gable roof featuring a wood-burning fireplace of natural, hand-cut stone. "With the outdoor fireplace there's no mess or fuss," Lynn says. "When we want a real fire, we just go outside."

A gabled-roofed outdoor dining room connected by covered porches to the outdoor living room is designed with open walls to catch the summer breeze.

ABOVE: Centered on the front of the Langers' timber frame is a gabled outdoor living room with a heavy timber roof. The handcrafted wood-burning fireplace, the accents surrounding the front door and the floor are of natural, hand-cut stone. A ceiling fan and accent lighting make the room usable day or night.

As for climate control inside the home's 2,042 square feet, Lynn says that she and Chris are very impressed with their insulation package and the heavy timber roof system that resulted in surprisingly low heating bills.

"We always heated with wood in Connecticut, so we installed a Hearthstone stove in the kitchen area and our first-ever gas fireplace insert in the great room's natural stone fireplace," Lynn says, explaining that these supplement a propane fired HVAC system that keeps the home toasty warm during Tennessee's colder months.

Lynn said the design for the entire house, which has 1,782 square feet on the main floor and a 240-square-foot loft, demonstrates "very wise use of space" and is expansion-ready. The Langers had a full walkout basement created using Superior Walls. When completed, there will be a common area, two spacious bedrooms, each with its own large win-

dow, a shared full bath and a shop.

"Our house is super comfortable for two people," says Lynn, mentioning that because they plan to spend the rest of their lives there, they made design choices like creating a custom, wheelchair-accessible master shower and placing all living and sleeping spaces on the main floor to ensure that they will remain comfortable.

Lynn says that she and Chris remained "happy through every step" of the process that they had chosen Honest Abe Log Homes as their designer and manufacturer and also to complete the dry-in phase of construction.

"We are convinced that if you want a log or timber frame home, you need to get it from an experienced and reputable manufacturer," Lynn says. "The people at Honest Abe and the quality of their services and products made them a great choice for us."

Honest Abe's homes are shipped across the U.S., and customers are



ABOVE: Many of Summit's clients opt for a corner treatment called a "staggered corner," in which the butt end actually comes out farther than the tip, showing the flared root base and giving the home a more rugged appearance. But this house has a more refined "flush-cut" corner, where the ends are trimmed to the same length. They are joined with a wedge notch, which provides a cavity that allows the logs to tighten as they settle.

LEFT: In crafting a rustic western red cedar log home for the Koblenz family, Robert Lockerby, co-owner of Summit Log & Timber Homes, and his team employed a variety of masterful techniques – especially the joinery. For example, the unique truss system is called a "bell truss," because within its more familiar "scissor truss" design, there's a hanging king post in the center, which resembles the striker of a bell.

RIGHT: The show-stopping staircase is the focal point of this home. Simple wood-slab treads are notched into a single, naturally curved log stringer that the owners affectionately nicknamed "the humpback whale." The stringer itself is roughly 24 inches in diameter. The result is a piece of functional art.







ABOVE: Where each log contained within the walls retains its natural contour, the kitchen cabinetry has a sleek, uniform appearance. This creates visual interest even though the walls and the cabinets are stained the same hue. Rough-honed black granite tops the counters and ties in with the slate tile flooring below.

LEFT: The large-scale, randomly shaped fieldstone encasing the fireplace (the same rock that was used for the foundation) creates the dramatic effect necessary for the hearth to hold its own among the large-diameter cedar log walls. Western red cedar is used quite frequently in the world of handcrafting because it's durable, insect resistant and very easy to work with. Plus, it has fantastic thermal properties, so it's highly energy efficient.

RIGHT: Cedar is very straight grained and typically only develops small checks where wood fibers separate. It settles about 4 inches for every 10 feet of wall. "It will take about two years for logs of this size and diameter to completely settle. Many people believe that it's the slow release of moisture that causes settling, and that's certainly part of it; but the bigger factor is gravity and the sheer weight of the building materials," says Robert.









TOP: Though the logs are large, the home's footprint is not. The cozy master bedroom boasts a reading nook, adding healthy doses of charm and natural light. The furniture is simple so as not to compete with the architecture.

ABOVE LEFT: In keeping with the home's "all natural" theme, the creative tile work in the master bath's shower mimics a babbling brook trickling down from a gentle waterfall and cascading over the threshold.

ABOVE RIGHT: For the master bath's non-log walls, the owners used a paint shade somewhere between mauve and mocha. The logs are stained with a 50 percent cut of Timber **Pro Coatings Canada** TR-32 "Harvest Brown."

BELOW: The Rocky Mountains provide the perfect canvas for a log home that echoes its rugged terrain in both its design and its materials.

BOTTOM: After a day of hiking, a convenient outdoor shower, located beneath the home's deck, provides an elegant place to clean up.










