Element Optics unveils upgraded Helix Gen 2 scope range for 2025

by Sportsman Gun Centre, has launched its Helix Gen 2 range. A relative newcomer to the optics market, Element has rapidly earned a reputation for producing quality scopes at an accessible price point. The Helix range has long been appreciated for its build quality, optical precision, and detailed reticles. With all 30mm tube models retailing for under £520, the value is clear.

The new range includes German glass, with a sharper image, improved clarity, and a widened field of view.
Turret-wise, Element has opted for a lower-profile design and added a capped windage turret. The internals have also been upgraded to provide



a more positive feel. Shooters get more clicks per turn, improved tracking, and the popular zero-stop mechanism. For those who prefer access to the windage controls, the option remains, via the swap of a turret cap to a supplied thread protector.

Element has retained the popular APR-1C and APR-2D reticles in the 6-24x models while giving the 4-16x model an overhaul in recognition of its versatility. For hunting and target

shooting, the MPR-1C combines a simplified floating centre point cross with fewer holdovers for fast target acquisition and fewer obstructions to the shooter's field of view.

Element will initially offer two magnification ranges in the Helix Gen 2 series: 6-24x50 and 4-16x44. The former is available with either first or second focal plane reticles. For added value, every scope includes a Platinum Lifetime Warranty.

CZ expands rimfire range with 457 Ergo and MDT ACC models

It's good news for fans of CZ rifles – distributed by Sportsman Gun Centre – with two exciting new models launching this summer.

First up is the 457 Ergo. Inspired by the 600 Ergo, the 457 variant combines a reinforced thumbhole stock with a cold hammer-forged barrel and adjustable trigger to create a versatile, lightweight hunting rifle that handles like no other. As standard, the Ergo comes with a five-round magazine, detachable




cheekpiece and threaded muzzle. Now available in .22LR and .17HMR, with the option of a 16" or 20" barrel, it has an RRP of £753.99.

Up next is possibly the best target rimfire CZ has ever created. The MDT ACC integrates a match-chambered 457 action with one of the finest PRS-inspired chassis ever built. Designed by pro shooters, the ACC is equipped with all the adjustment a shooter could possibly need, along with numerous M-LOK slots for weights

and accessories, meaning the gun can be set up and adjusted to suit any scenario. For further versatility, the chassis features an Arca-Swiss rail for bipod/tripod mounting and a vertical pistol grip for comfort.

To maximise the MDT's potential, CZ has included a threaded heavy barrel, match chamber, and an adjustable trigger for consistent shot-to-shot performance. It is currently available with a 24" barrel in .22LR calibre. RRP: £2,611.99.



'Hostile trading' with US to hit UK firearms

by US President Donald Trump
have sent shockwaves through
the firearms industry. While the
Trump administration claims these
protectionist measures are designed
to revitalise US manufacturing and
protect American jobs, industry leaders
on both sides of the Atlantic warn that
the new tariffs are likely to raise costs,
strain supply chains, and destabilise
already fragile international markets.

Reports suggest tariffs on some consumer electronics may be lifted – a move that could impact certain product categories within the shooting and outdoor sectors. With trade policy continuing to shift rapidly, UK businesses are being urged to proceed with caution.

Stephen Jolly, Executive
Director of the UK's Gun Trade
Association (GTA), said the recent
announcement of new US import
tariffs has created significant unease
in some portions of the UK trade.

"While the GTA does not take a position on political outcomes, we have formally stated our opposition to tariffs and our concern over the possibility of retaliatory measures," he said.

"We have also responded to a government consultation on international trade, outlining our sector's contributions to the economy and the risks posed by a hostile trading environment.

"As part of our response,
I have written directly to the
Secretary of State to express
our industry's concern about the
imposition of a 10% tariff on British
exports to the United States.

"In that letter, I urged the Government to avoid retaliatory measures that risk worsening the current situation and instead focus on securing a bilateral free trade agreement with the US administration."

As we go to press, the United States has reduced its tariffs on selected Chinese goods from 145% to 30%, while China will lower its retaliatory tariffs on US products from 125% to 10%. However, not all duties have been permanently removed, some have merely been suspended.

Speaking to reporters, former
President Trump warned that these
tariffs could be reinstated or even
increased within three months if
negotiations fail to produce further
progress. The impact of these changes
is likely to be felt by consumers, with
potential implications for pricing
across a wide range of goods.

Silence over licensing speaks volumes, says BASC

More than two-thirds of police forces in England and Wales have failed to give assurances to support a Home Office pledge that money raised by increased firearms licensing fees will be reinvested into firearms licensing.

BASC wrote to all Police and Crime Commissioners (PCCs) and Chief Constables earlier this year, following its condemnation of the government's decision to hike firearms licensing fees in January without consultation or addressing inefficiencies in the licensing system. However, to date, just 13 of the 42 forces have confirmed that extra funds will be reinvested.


Bill Harriman, Director of Firearms at BASC, said: "The government has no power to tell individual constabularies how to spend their income. If there is no certainty that these additional fees will be used to enhance the system, the justification for such a significant rise is deeply flawed. Despite allowing more than adequate time for them to give us the reassurances we were seeking on behalf of our members, we have been met with silence from a significant number of forces.

"This lack of transparency raises serious concerns that the additional money may not go where it is needed most. Without proper investment, firearms licensing services will remain inefficient. Those who rely on them will pay more without seeing any improvement in service delivery."

Currently, 22 forces are yet to respond to BASC's enquiries, and seven have said they are still awaiting direction from a PCC or Chief Constable. BASC has pledged to continue scrutinising police budgets and will monitor whether the promised funding is being used to support firearms licensing departments.

Proposed shotgun law could leave farmers defenceless

> Beefed-up restrictions to UKwide shotgun storage laws could leave farmers powerless to protect their livestock from predators, says the Countryside Alliance.

The UK government is considering stricter shotgun regulations following the 2021 Plymouth shooting, where six people were killed by a legally owned firearm. One proposal under review is the requirement for shotguns to be stored away from owners' homes, possibly in gun shops. This has raised alarm among rural organisations who argue that such changes would hinder farmers' ability to respond promptly to threats from predators like foxes and dogs, especially during weekends when access to offsite storage could be restricted.

Currently, over 500,000 shotgun owners in Britain, primarily in rural areas, rely on these firearms for various purposes, including dispatching diseased or injured livestock and controlling predators. Shotguns

are regulated under the Firearms Act 1968. However, the proposed reclassification of shotguns as Section 1 firearms would impose stricter licensing criteria similar to rifles.

Critics of the proposed changes argue that the issue lies not with the current laws but with the administration of the licensing system. Many advocate for a centralised and digitised firearms licensing authority to replace the fragmented police-run process, aiming to improve public safety without compromising rural needs.


Countryside Alliance Director, Jake Swindells, highlighted the potential impact of the proposal: "To some, a shotgun is a wildly misunderstood piece of equipment, yet it is a daily part of rural life across the UK and is relied upon to control predators that would otherwise desecrate lambs and endangered species, such as lapwing and curlew. If a shotgun has to be stored away from a farmer's home

address, it means they may have to watch their flock being torn to pieces from Saturday evening before being able to access their shotgun at the gun shop at 9am on Monday morning."

Estate Manager, Rory Kennedy, added: "While unlikely, the concept of requiring any legal guns to be stored at a registered firearms dealer defies all pragmatic understanding of how people engage in their legal sport. When you then consider hardworking keepers and farmers, who have such blurred lines between working and home hours, even the mere discussion highlights the gulf of understanding between bumbling urban bureaucrats and the realities of those delivering rural land management and conservation."





Best on Test

Hawke Frontier 34 FFP 3-18x50







No single scope is good for all scenarios, yet this latest 34mm First Focal Plane (FFP) optic from Hawke is one of the most versatile specifications available. The 50mm objective lens enables decent light entry to the main tube, which itself, at 34mm diameter, enables greater mechanical adjustment for longer-range shots. The scope is available in MRAD (seen here) or Minutes of Angle (MOA) and correspondingly offers 46 MRAD or 158 MOA of elevation range for reaching out.

Flip it open

Hawke supplies flip-up lens covers for the smoothly finished, hard-anodised aluminium main tube as well as a 100mm screw-in sunshade that will help with unwanted light distractions.

Hawke's website contains extensive details on the scope, reticle, and physical dimensions. To summarise, there is 45mm and 65mm of free tube space in front of and behind the central saddle, allowing you to position your rings correctly for proper eye relief. The scope should be set 102mm (4") from your eye, is rated for all calibres in terms of recoil,

and comes with a lifetime warranty to support its durability claims.

Up, down, left, and right

The right-side windage turret lifts to turn and offers a very logical 5 MRAD (50 clicks) of adjustment left and right from centre, with clear markings on the easily reset outer dial.

The elevation turret provides 10 MRAD per rotation, divided into one hundred 1cm@100m clicks, each firmly detented to deliver a positive tactile feel when adjusting, without risk of overrun. The clicks can also be delicately heard without creating too much disturbance.

A detailed instruction manual is supplied but, in simple terms, three circumferential grub screws unlock the outer engraved dials to reset their position once your rifle is zeroed. If desired, you can also remove the elevation dial entirely to access the simple, yet perfectly functional, zero-stop collar underneath, which allows setup for negative travel as well. In my opinion, this is a straightforward and effective solution that avoids unnecessary complexity and excessive cost.

Parallax and ret

The left side parallax dial adjusts down to 14m from infinity, making the scope suitable for airguns, rimfires and centrefires. It's backlash-free and there is no physical perception of the mechanics moving within as the dial smoothly rotates. External to the dial is the illumination control, which offers 11 intensity settings for the red reticle within, and power comes from the CR2032 battery housed under the screw cap.

The FFP Mil Pro Ext reticle is complex, with a multitude of 0.1, 0.2, 0.5 and full mil markings, as well as lateral aim-off dots extending into the lower quadrants too, all of which are illuminated.

Overall, I found the reticle excellent for engaging the steel targets typically encountered in PRS-type environments. At the lowest magnification, the reticle is barely visible, which is desirable, as when illuminated, it presents a simpler aiming mark in the centre of the now extremely broad field of view, allowing for fast target acquisition in hunting scenarios. This provides the best of both worlds.



Throw lever

The magnification collar is knurled for grip, and a removable throw lever is supplied for fast operation. Hawke also supplies Allen keys for setup, and it's nice to see spare grub screws included should you ever lose one when altering turrets.

The 46mm diameter ocular body is parallel and will accept clamped-on accessories like night vision or scope cameras. The rear fast-focus eyepiece has a locking collar to ensure that it stays in position, even if the flip-up aluminium lens cap gets nudged, and it offers crisp reticle focus with minimal eye strain. The field of view is flat from edge to edge, with no annoying diminishing colour bands or vignettes from the easily accessible eyepiece.

Offering mid-range magnification up to 18x, rather than the 30x available on the other Frontier 34 FFP model, makes the exit pupil more forgiving. This is especially noticeable when shooting from challenging positions, where your natural alignment behind any optic is tested. The eye relief remains relatively static throughout the zoom range, and the multi-coatings appear to deliver a balanced image with good colour contrast and brightness, complementing the precision-ground lenses that provide strong optical resolution.

Standards

This optic is well-made and finished. The tracking of the internal mechanics when dialling for varied distances appeared to be accurate, and, being in MRAD, it allowed me to use my own rifle across multiple distances and shooting formats, using detailed and previously confirmed data on previous engagements (DOPE). The ability to swap to this scope and immediately find it accurate and easy to use, with no real problems or concerns arising, made for a long afternoon of enjoyable shooting without getting caught out or feeling that I was being held back when using a rimfire out to 350m.

Conclusion

Hawke seems to make a scope for every user, and this new H7 specification FFP scope for tactical and precision shooters is highly impressive. FFP scopes, where the reticle appears to grow as the magnification increases, maintain a perfect correlation between the reticle's subtensions and the turrets, so you can dial off or aim off worry-free at any magnification. Similarly, with lock-to-turn turrets and a zero stop, this is an ideal optic for a multi-distance competition where you can make immediate changes to compensate for your bullet's trajectory.

Although a larger 5-30x56 optic is available, the 3-18x benefits from smaller dimensions, lighter weight, and perhaps most importantly, it offers a greater field of view for fast target acquisition. The versatile specification and medium build dimensions also don't rule it out as a daylight hunting scope capable of taking on technically demanding shots. GM



These are just some of the reasons to upgrade.

Magtech and RWS Primers

With some of the more commonly used brands of primers now in short supply, we are all having to look to other brands that are still available.

Magtech

The large rifle primers on test come in trays of 100, with each one in its own compartment for maximum safety. The primers are brass-coloured, and they have two triangular shapes stamped into the cup, which is an unusual feature for a primer. Unlike other brands, the feet of the anvil do not protrude at all from the cup, which is also unusual. This might be why some people report that they do not flip in a primer flipper tray, but during testing, they all turned over without any issue in a Lee Precision tray. They also feed through a priming tool absolutely fine.

The primers seat reliably with a range of tools, including hand-held, press-mounted and bench-mounted types, and require no more pressure than other brands. Once seated, it is clear that the primers sit below flush with the face of the case head, and this is presumably due to the fact that the anvil feet do not project. When the anvil feet of primers do project, seating the primers pushes the feet up inside the cup to varying degrees, but they still contribute a small amount to the depth of the seated primer.

In both .308 Winchester and .45-70 Government calibres, the Magtech primers functioned





without any misfires at all, despite them having a thicker primer cup than some other brands.

RWS

Packed into slightly smaller trays, but still fully protected, the nickel-coated brass RWS primers on test were also large rifle. The anvil feet do stick out slightly, so the primers flip without any issues, and they also feed OK through various priming tools. They seat very easily and actually feel slightly softer than the Magtech, and once they bottom out in the primer pocket, you can feel them compress slightly (when using a hand-priming tool).

Initially seated with a hand-priming tool, the RWS primers did not fire every time, with four out of ten not firing on the first attempt, three of those four firing on the second strike, and one not firing at all after several attempts. With the second batch of test rounds, the primers were seated



with a bench-mounted tool, and a bit more force, and they all fired first time with no light strikes at all.

It is not unusual to have to change your seating method for different brands of primers, and until you find the right tool for a particular brand, any light strikes are usually down to the seating method and not the actual primers.

Conclusion

Both RWS and Magtech primers are a good alternative to the more well-known brands that can't always be tracked down. The initial issue with the RWS brand not firing was soon rectified by using a different seating method, and neither brand had a detrimental effect on the performance of the finished ammunition.

Salomon X Ultra Tracker GTX Ranger Boots

Salomon's X Ultra Tracker boots are a lighter-weight mid-season design that looks ideal for spring and summer wear.

The design is built around the Advanced Chassis concept to provide lighter, more agile manoeuvrability without compromising underfoot support or the reliable waterproofing of Gore-Tex.

The boots weigh 1038g for the pair in size 11/46 and feel light underfoot with a deft footfall compared to heavier full-leather boots.

The construction begins with a moderate sole pattern and a 6mm tread depth, providing a good grip on slippery surfaces. Broad, open, flat areas between the treads ensure there is plenty of flexibility for your foot to mould to hard, uneven ground, and you do not feel excessively raised, with the heel lifting 25mm from flat.

Protection

Externally, the rand features a raised protective toe and is bonded to the brown leather/synthetic upper, which is interspersed with green fabric over the Gore-Tex lining.

The closure uses traditional lacing, with wings on the tongue ensuring 85mm of full water resistance. A deep padded collar surrounds the ankle bone for protection, while a tall tab at the rear of the boot offers additional support for the Achilles tendon, as well as providing plenty to grip when pulling the boots on.



Despite the lightweight construction, the boots are reasonably stiff and remain easy to put on and take off without crumpling.

Lifestyle

I usually opt for a size 45 in boots, but a few brands, with Salomon among them, tend to require a 46 for the correct fit and comfort. These boots fit comfortably and are nowhere near as stiff as a full-leather boot, so ankle support and rigidity are in a different league, although they are still far more supportive than trail shoes or wellies. Walking is comfortable and

quiet. The soles initially seemed to retain mud, but once worn in, they lost that newness and started to shed it more easily. However, when it comes to early winter mud, the variety and consistency are almost infinite.

The boots have remained waterproof and, on my feet, have never become too hot, seeming to ventilate perspiration very well. They are everyday boots and do not offer the ankle or lower-leg support needed for serious hills or deep rocky ground, but they are correspondingly far lighter and more refreshing to wear when walking over long distances of easy to moderate terrain.

Verdict

The X Ultra Tracker boots are available in UK sizes 3.5 to 14.5, so you will not struggle for choice. I would categorise them as a great daily boot: comfortable for walking and driving, and great for muddy or wet ground if you are caught by surprise. However, if you want greater ankle support, it is worth choosing one of the higher versions. They are windproof, thanks to the Gore-Tex, which is not always crucial at ground level but was certainly appreciated when seated in a high seat. Despite this, they remain lightweight and offer little in the way of thermal insulation. GM

> Stoeger Airguns, for those unfamiliar, is part of the Beretta group, and there's no doubt some of the style and elegance synonymous with Italian design has crept into the line-up here. There's been a slow evolution of features along the way, and the model names have been tweaked too.

On test here is the Stoeger RX20 TAC, a spring-powered design that's aimed at the budget sector of the market.

Sharp focus

The RX20 TAC comes as a package deal, so you get a Stoeger-branded scope and mounts, along with bolt-on accessory rails, interchangeable stock elements, and an instruction book. Let's start by saying the kit scope is one of the very best I've come across. The 3-9x40 AO specification is a huge improvement on the basic 4x32 scope Stoeger has used

before, and with the mounts already fitted, it took me seconds to locate the arrestor stud of the rear mount into the pre-drilled hole in the receiver.

Pro-adaptive

There's some bold styling going on with this RX20, and I love the dropdown semi-target grip, flowing lines, contoured grip, and fore-end. Stoeger makes a big thing of their 'Human Tech Design' approach with their models, and this is apparently 'inspired by Urbino, a World Heritage city, and the cradle of Humanism', according to the company's marketing. Blimey, who'd have thought it? Anyhow, part of this design is what they term 'Pro Adaptive Chequering'. This is the grip pattern moulded around areas of the pistol grip, fore-end, and barrel shroud. However, another big selling point is the Multi Grip System (MGS). The RX20 TAC comes complete

with three sets of interchangeable panels for both the pistol grip and fore-end. Just use the Allen key provided, and the choice of colour and grip is yours. Stick with the black Pro Adaptive grip, or switch to either the blue embossed or orange version.

Making the switch is as easy as it looks, and visuals can be transformed in seconds, as well as providing a subtle change of feel. Look to the butt, and those two coloured spacers can be removed, one or both, to fine-tune the length of pull. Fancy a Picatinny accessory rail? Well, that's also possible, given this model comes with two, one for each side of the fore-end.

Silencer

Up front, the bull-barrel configuration immediately catches the eye, being formed from a moulded synthetic shroud. This conceals a fairly short 14"









barrel, and a few baffles over the last few inches. Silencers of any sort are undeniably more effective in taming the crack of a PCP, but Stoeger's system here does have some effect, taming the muzzle report to a very acceptable level. And with the moulded grip patterns, the silencer is also the perfect cocking aid.

Handling and firing cycle

During testing, simply breaking open the breech was initially a bit of a challenge, but the stiffness eased noticeably as the test progressed, suggesting the sprung detent just needs a little wearing in. I started with a jolt over the knee, but after a lengthy first session, I could complete the task easily by holding

the butt into the groin in the normal way. For the record, the cocking stroke itself proved easy and super smooth. Just ensure that each pellet is pushed flush before closing the breech, as you would with any break-barrel airgun. With this in mind, softer pellets, such as JSB derivatives, make life easier, as they can be far easier to push home.

Firing this Stoeger reveals a fairly basic T2 trigger mechanism, and while it is specified as 'double stage', in reality, there's a very long second stage which creeps somewhat. Par for the course at this price point, but with a well-shaped blade, it's all perfectly usable. I found just gently pulling through the creep was the best approach, and with

concentration and familiarity, some decent results were possible. As for the firing cycle, there is some recoil, but little spring resonance, just a ring of the action and a muted muzzle report. In fact, I'd go as far as to say the RX20 feels well above average to shoot, for this grade of airgun.

Added feature

Now, before moving to performance, it's time to look at another star feature that the RX20 TAC has up its sleeve. I last reviewed a similar springer from Stoeger some six years back, and I remember thinking that the cheekpiece looked like it should move, but that all the definition and

















detail were purely cosmetic. Well, not anymore, as Stoeger has incorporated an adjustable cheekpiece with this model. To make the adjustment, use the Allen key supplied, remove the screw, and then pull the cheekpiece upwards. Here, you'll notice two further anchor holes. Line up the required hole, and replace the screw. It's a great asset, and it's surprising just how much it helps you to achieve a perfectly supported eye/scope position. It will minimise muscle strain and parallax error by giving the shooter a more consistent view through the scope.

Range results

On the range, I was keen to see what the RX20 could do, and Wasps gave a total velocity spread of 14fps over a ten-shot string, with an average energy output of 10.1ft/lbs. That's great consistency, but switching to JTS Dead 'Center' pellets (16.1gr), the total velocity spread shrank to an incredible 8fps, and energy jumped to 11.2ft/ lbs, proof that individual pellet trials are always worth the effort. Of course, consistency doesn't automatically equate to accuracy, but here, downrange over 30 yards, I managed 34" groups with both pellet brands, so encouraging results all around.

Verdict

This model seems to vary in price depending on the dealer, but even at the upper end, it represents good value for money, with plenty of detail, built-in features, and a decent level of performance on offer. Imaginative design elements certainly add to the shooting experience, and Stoeger deserves credit for its original approach. Ideal as a budget hunter or novice starter kit. GM

back in 2016, and if my memory serves me correctly, this was Kral's first PCP air rifle. It's hard to believe when you consider the extensive range of models they now produce, with all manner of configurations, but it all started with this plucky little sporter.

Note the manual safety catch

Slimline K

On test here is the very latest carbine 'K' model, and this trims both length and weight from the original design brief. It's 5.5" shorter and almost half a pound lighter, which is significant and a great option, especially for hunters who want a fast-handling PCP. It's easier to manoeuvre in a hide, for example, and less weight means it shouldn't tire the user over an extended session. Basic stuff, but it matters!

Available in tasty Turkish walnut or black synthetic, both options, intriguingly, are listed as weighing the same: 7lbs. Now, I should point out an important detail here, which is that if you take the black synthetic stock route, as per my test rifle, it features an adjustable cheekpiece—a detail which is missing on the walnut version, so something to bear in mind.

Getting started

Alongside the Puncher K in the box, we get a bag of goodies, which includes the instruction booklet, two magazines, the filling adaptor, spare seals, a single-shot tray, and some Allen keys. There's an abundance of features to get through, as Kral gives you quite a bit for the money, but I'll work through them stage by stage.

Fitting a scope is perhaps the best place to start, and Kral's clever twin rail mounting system, incorporated here, is brilliant. The inner rail is a conventional dovetail, but for those who feel happier using Picatinny mounts that lock into the cut-outs, then simply use the outer rail. It's a simple idea, but avoids all the stress of not having the correct mounts.

My test gun came directly from the UK importers, Range Right, and they had already fitted one of their popular Konus scopes, the Konuspro Evo 3-12x50. This is quite an impressive optic in itself, with the only downside being that it is quite weighty, slightly defeating the object of this super-compact, lightweight sporter. Nevertheless, for the purposes of my test, it did the job nicely, so I left it in place for the duration.

Eye relieved

Next, we'll check eye/scope alignment, which is a job we can do without even firing a shot. Get into position, mount the rifle, and we're looking for the point at which a full sight picture is possible, with minimal strain and full support. This is where the adjustable cheekpiece comes in, and with a user-friendly pushbutton mechanism, it's a great design. Just press the button and gently move the cheekpiece to the desired height. It technically clicks into notches, but the spring seemed to hold it at whatever level I selected. I counted 10 different settings including fully closed, and the panel can be raised just over 1.5", offering plenty of versatility for anyone, and a serious asset in the features list.

Multi-shot

As mentioned, we get two magazines to play with here, and they feel impressive. Kral's first design of magazine on the original Puncher I tested many moons ago was fiddly and overly complicated, but wow, have they learned their craft along the way. For this latest Puncher K we see before us really is a very different animal. The magazine system is completely different, and I can











happily report that, despite its plastic construction, it's very precise and well made. My test rifle was in .22 calibre, which uses 12-shot magazines; the .177 version holds 14 shots, while the .25 variant comes with a 10-shot mag.

Filling the magazine is done in the familiar way, by twisting the cover clockwise right round against spring pressure. Next, drop the first pellet head-first into the chamber, which holds the drum, then turn the cover slowly back anti-clockwise, filling each chamber in turn.

Charging regime

Kral specifies this model as having a maximum fill pressure of 200bar, and with a 200cc cylinder on board, there's

plenty of air reserves. Look underneath the fore-end, and there's a neatly recessed manometer, clearly marked with three coloured sections: yellow 0–100bar, the green working pressure section of 100–200bar, and then red showing high pressure. Work within the green section, and all will be well.

The filling valve sits at the front of the cylinder, and there's a push-fit metal dust cover that needs to be pulled away. This proved a bit stiff on test, which was irritating, as it made it tricky to remove the cap without scratching the shroud. It should ease with use, but further irritation comes with the filling valve itself, which looks like a Foster fitting, but isn't. No need to panic, as the dedicated adaptor

comes supplied. This has a springloaded clasp inside, which again proved a bit tight on my example. Again, after a little fiddling, I had 200bar slowly delivered, and the stubborn cover replaced. Right, almost ready.

Full shroud

I love the visuals of this Puncher K, and the full-length shroud plays its part, creating the 'bull barrel'. However, with the barrel just a whisper over 16", which is quite short for a PCP, unsurprisingly, there's a right old crack as she fires. The barrel comes within an inch of the muzzle, so there's no sound suppression going on. No cause for alarm, though. Just remove the knurled cap, and there's a ½" UNF thread ready

and waiting for a silencer of your choice. I'd think hard here, as it always seems a shame to lose that super-short profile. If hunting duties are on the cards, though, that's a different matter, and a moddy will be a prerequisite.

Trigger unit

When you consider the high-pressure air that we are dealing with in this style of airgun, it really should be standard procedure that we get decent instructions, but many are basic in the extreme, in my experience. Not so here, as Kral includes a large, easy-to-read, commendably clear, fully illustrated instruction booklet, covering basic safety, filling the rifle, loading the magazine, troubleshooting, etc.

Another feature covered is tweaking the two-stage trigger, and this is adjustable for the first stage, second stage, and sear contact. This is good news. The bad news is that the stock first needs to be removed for access to the relevant screws. Stock removal is via a chunky Allen bolt sitting just in front of the trigger, so easy to do. As for trigger adjustment, if you're not confident, then just seek experience. Of course, the one area where we can all dive right in is the adjustable, match-style trigger blade. Slacken the small screw in the support pillar, and just move it as required. It's a great feature and one of those things that make more difference than you realise.


Testing, testing

OK, we're off. Pull back the biathlonstyle side-lever, and it flies back 45 degrees under spring pressure. Completing the full 90 degrees takes only modest effort. Now insert the full magazine in from the right side, into its groove, and push home the lever. This takes more effort than some, but on test, it all proved smooth and, I have to say, totally reliable. Cycle the lever, and shots come as quick as you like, with the number of shots remaining displayed in the tiny shot count window on the mag. It's impossible to fire just air too, as when the mag is empty, the bolt won't return. Fancy a single shot? Then the small plastic breech insert replaces the mag in the normal way.









Over the chronograph, I managed 100 shots from the recommended 200bar fill, and stopped when residual pressure dropped to 100bar, the bottom end of the clearly marked green sector on the gauge. This returned a total spread of 48fps. This is an unregulated action, remember, so if you stick to 60–70 shots, you'll see a tighter velocity band over the chrono.

Don't forget that there is also a built-in power adjuster in the form of a silver knob on the right side. Dial it right down, and you'll get a crazy number of shots, low-powered, around the 3ft/lbs mark, but a great feature when practice or plinking is the priority. Just dial it back up for full power.

Accuracy-wise, my test rifle started with enlarged ragged holes over 30 yards, so I moved to 40 yards to give it a fair evaluation, and my best efforts were quite superb. Centre-to-centre, a fraction over a ¼", which is top class in most people's books, and that was reasonably easy to come by, with Air Arms Diabolos straight from the tin! Spend more time tweaking, and getting everything just so, and this Puncher K looks to be a serious bit of kit.

Verdict

Take the time to get the optimum fill pressure right, to maximise consistency, as is the case with

any unregulated PCP, and if my test model is anything to go by, this latest Kral Puncher K is unlikely to disappoint. A compact, solid tool that looks ideal in a hunting scenario. GM







> Precihole Sports is billed as India's number-one airgun manufacturer.

When you consider the size of the country and its airgun market, which is apparently significant, that's no mean boast. Add into the mix Air Arms, as the newly appointed global distributors for Precihole's hardware, and I think it's safe to say we'll be hearing a lot more about this brand over the coming years.

Traditional/conventional

Looking at the Precihole brochure from Air Arms showing the models chosen for import, I have to admit to a little confusion, as there are actually two models with identical slimline sporter stocks, and very similar profiles: the Athena, which has a gas-ram power plant, and the near-identical-looking Minerva.

The Minerva on test here is a full-powered, break-barrel, spring-piston rifle, currently available for around £200. It represents impressive value for money, so I was eager to give it a proper once-over.

First impressions

Precihole takes no chances with their level of packaging, and the Minerva comes safe and secure, recessed into a cut-out of dense foam. Alongside the gun is the standard security padlock and a basic instruction leaflet that covers maintenance, safety, operation, and sight adjustment.

Out of the box, the Minerva feels solid and robust, and while the chemical bluing is a little dull (an obvious area of cost-saving at the production stage), everything looks and feels precise and well-machined.

Elegant sporter

Precihole lists this model as an 'elegant and ergonomic sporter', and there's no doubt that the sleek moulded polymer stock looks the part. I love the graceful fore-end with a subtle swell at the tip, and with the fore-end and pistol grip area sporting precise chequering, grip and looks are significantly enhanced.

The cheekpiece is well-defined, but I reckon it could do with being a bit higher. It's perfect for use with the open sights that come fitted as standard, but with a scope bolted onto the dovetail rails, I found the cheek wasn't as supportive as it could be. To be fair, this is a very common shortcoming



on spring rifles, so I can't grumble too much, especially given the low price.

Sighting in

Open sights are here as mentioned, and to be fair, they work well. Up front, the hooded foresight is a moulded affair that slides over the barrel and is fixed in place with one central grub screw. This means it can be removed further down the line if deemed necessary.

As for the rear sight, this is an all-metal design, so should last the course, and it offers fully adjustable, clearly numbered finger wheels for both windage and elevation. I'm pleased to say the adjusters follow logic too, as far as direction and movement are concerned, which isn't always the case! The sight picture is precise, and all worked well on test.

However, if you get tired of the open sights, then fitting a scope up top is a piece of cake. I would always

recommend the use of a one-piece mount with spring guns in the long term, just for peace of mind where scope creep is concerned, but with an arrestor stud anchor hole cut into the receiver, it's an option to use standard ring mounts and an arrestor block.

I actually forgot to use an arrestor block on test, but didn't have an issue. However, over time, most scopes will move under recoil. All bases are covered with the Minerva in any case.

Handling and operation

With over two decades of experience in production methods, which also includes barrel making, Precihole unsurprisingly fits their own barrels to their airguns.

To cock the action, the Minerva requires a mild jolt to knock open the breech, then it's fairly easy to cock the action. The stroke itself is super smooth, with no spring graunch, and

inspecting the open breech, it's hard not to conclude that everything again looks precise and nicely machined. Press home the pellet flush in the breech, and lock up the barrel.

One detail that stood out when I first saw this model was the beautifully shaped trigger blade. It looks sleek too, having been left 'in the white', unblued, so to speak. The combination of its near-straight profile and wide blade gives it an enhanced feel, and with the matching in-guard safety tab positioned ready, it all looks good. However, with the rifle cocked, the safety is automatic, and this is slightly irritating, given that the safety is too stiff to nudge off with the trigger finger. I found I needed to pinch the safety against the trigger guard, to take it 'off'. No big deal, but a minor irritation as stated.

No mention of trigger adjustment was found in the leaflet supplied,


















yet I couldn't resist a quick tweak of the large Allen screw positioned just forward of the blade. It didn't seem to make a lot of difference, but all worked OK, and this trigger still has to be considered way above average for this grade of rifle. The first stage is reasonably light, and the final release is both crisp and predictable.

Downrange

So, how does the action feel? Well, where my test gun was concerned, there wasn't a hint of spring twang, and the internal set-up felt quite sophisticated. Yes, the shot is lively and there's plenty of recoil, but the shot is a quick snap with no resonance. This is probably the result of a tight spring guide going about its business.

Accuracy-wise, the Minerva was tested first from a beanbag rest, then shot from an over-arm FT sitting position, allowing the action to do its

thing, unrestricted. Springers aren't overly keen on any rested position, but the Minerva returned some reasonable groups. The sitting position won overall, and 0.5" groups over 30 yards were achieved with relative ease. These results are not to be sniffed at. Groups off the beanbag, for the record, were only a fraction larger.

As for consistency figures over the chronograph, my example produced fairly textbook 10-shot strings. Air Arms Diabolo Field and the favoured Air Arms Diabolo Express posted a total velocity spread of 12fps and 15fps respectively. In the real world, that's about as good as it gets, and, taken along with performance and feel in general, it was a satisfying finish to my experience overall.

Verdict

On test, this Precihole Sports Minerva proved a worthy and highly capable

spring-powered airgun. It's fairly traditional in what it's offering, and the finish is admittedly basic, yet its execution and refinement of design are well up to the mark given the asking price. So yes, it's a cliché, but this really is a lot of rifle for the money; a versatile all-rounder, a general-purpose sporter, and more than capable of handling close to medium-range hunting duties. **GM**





> CO2 as a power source is a godsend for designers, as the standard 12g capsule that's normally used takes up so little space inside the action.

Manufacturers are therefore freed up to produce all manner of exciting multi-shots, and Action Sports Games (ASG) is one such big player that has earned its place in this crowded market.

Mimicking live firearms in both appearance and functionality is a huge part of the appeal, and factoring in the fast-fire capability, it's not hard to

Quality feel

On test here is a classy example of ASG's craft, in the form of the Dan Wesson 6" Revolver, and inside the box, alongside the pistol, there's an instruction manual, an Allen key, a speedloading device, six dummy rounds, and a Picatinny rail. The revolver is well machined and finished, and when you pick it up for the first time, its 2.3lb weight adds a real air of authenticity.

see why this type of airgun remains so popular.

My test gun features a rifled barrel and fires pellets, but there is also a BB-firing version. Why would anyone wish to go down that route? God alone knows! Suffice it to say, the pellet version will be an altogether more rewarding, not to mention safer, experience. And whilst talking pellet firers, I should also point out that among the extensive ASG product portfolio, there is a 2.5" barrel version of this same silver finish revolver, for an altogether more compact feel. Opt for my full-length version, and there is of course a touch of Dirty Harry about the proceedings, and it balances superbly in the aim.

Gripping stuff

As usual with this style of pistol, a standard 12g CO2 capsule is neatly stowed inside the grip. So, to gain access and 'gas up', the rear panel of the synthetic moulded grip just pulls up and slides clear. A fresh capsule can now be dropped into the cavity neck-first, and then the tensioning bolt in the base can be tweaked to pierce the capsule. Try and do this in a positive way so that no gas is wasted in the process. Snap the grip cover back to the closed position, and the pistol now has power.

Six-shots

Loading pellets can be done in several ways, and here are the options: the six dummy rounds are each fitted with a synthetic liner, so just insert a pellet into the liner, and push it flush, just to ensure there's no fouling of the pellet as the cylinder rotates. Pellets can be loaded while the dummy rounds are in situ in the cylinder, or separately, and chambered after filling. As for the speedloader, this requires the primed rounds to be pushed into place in the unit rear-first. Then, when all six are in place, the rear spring-loaded plunger is compressed, and twisted, which locks and holds the rounds. This whole assembly is then





offered up to the gun's open cylinder, and forward pressure releases the rounds into the gun.

And action!

I find it an appealing feature that the trigger can be shot single or double action, and although either route works well, by far the more subtle route is single action. Pull back the hammer each time to set the trigger and to significantly reduce its pull weight, which obviously aids accuracy. The hammer is very smooth in operation, as is the pleasantly broad trigger, and it's all very satisfying — a word I keep returning to with this pistol.

Aiming up, the sight picture is pretty good, with a perfectly proportioned rear notch and a foresight that features a small red dot. The rear sight is adjustable via a screwdriver, for both windage and elevation, but if you fancy fitting a scope, red dot, or other alternative sighting system,

this is also possible. It is, however, a fiddly process that requires a tiny drift pin to be knocked out so that you can remove the rear sight. With the rear sight removed, the small Picatinny rail supplied can be screwed into position. I stuck with open sights on test, but again, plenty of options.

Results

Firing the Dan Wesson is an enjoyable process, and I'd guess it's quite efficient on air, as it's actually not very noisy. Groups of around 1.25" centre-to-centre at 10 yards with Remington Express Spike Pointed pellets are perfectly respectable, and that level of accuracy makes rewarding plinking or informal competitions a real possibility.

Where the number of shots is concerned, the caveat remains with CO2 that this is dependent upon the type of pellet used and the ambient temperature. Super cold weather will make the system less











efficient, dropping the shot count accordingly. On test, I recorded an impressive 115 shots before the tell-tale velocity drop, signifying the end of a charge.

Afterthought

As for the speedloader, I wouldn't get too excited, as it's largely unnecessary and feels rather laboured. It's also a bit awkward to create enough space to eject the rounds. So, for everyday use, stick to loading pellets into the rounds while they are in situ within the gun's cylinder. It's easy, fairly quick, and really no big deal. Indeed, for the record, I managed to load all six within 17 seconds!

The speedloader could come into its own if you had a spare set of rounds already primed and

were taking part in a timed competition, and in that scenario, grabbing the speedloader for follow-up shots would add an exciting edge, all against the clock.

Verdict

As it stands, this Dan Wesson revolver is just a very nice airgun to use and own. The firearm looks will appeal to many and definitely add an extra layer of intrigue, but it is of course so much more than a collector's piece. Stunning looks, great build quality, and rewarding performance, all for reasonable

money. So a big thumbs-up

from me, and an easy







Daystate has been pioneering air rifle design for over 45 years. Its latest release, the Blackwolf, is no exception when it comes to innovation. Could this be the ultimate mechanical modular air rifle platform?

At the time of writing this review, there are no less than 32 different configurations of the Blackwolf available 'off the shelf', and at least 60 optional extra accessories are listed on the Daystate website. If that's not the pinnacle of customisation, I don't know what is. Eight of these models are aimed at sub-12ft/lbs UK shooters, while the other options are all geared towards FAC shooters. Prices range from £1,795 for the baseline 12ft/lbs carbon grey cylinder model, up to £2,950 for the high-power FAC HiLite tactical version.

Reservoir sizes

There are numerous configurations of air reservoirs available, including 200cc and 300cc alloy cylinders, plus 300cc, 480cc, and 580cc carbon bottles (HiLite).

No matter which configuration you choose, they all utilise Daystate's quick-fill probe, and the fill port is neatly housed underneath a magnetic cover on the underside of the fore-end. This is yet another clever piece of engineering from the boffins at Daystate HQ. I have absolutely no doubt that this one is going to stay put, even during the rough and tumble of a hectic scramble through the woods while hunting. The magnets used are extremely strong, and the flush design means it cannot be knocked off by a twig or suchlike.

From minimum to maximum

There's a power adjustment wheel at the back end of the action, which has 20 modes of adjustment from minimum to maximum. Basically, as you turn the wheel, it moves the hammer spring adjuster backwards or forwards, increasing or decreasing the tension. If you're shooting FAC, then you can also purchase a more powerful spring to help increase the rifle's overall power output.



A rifle of this quality requires the very best regulator, and just like their other PCP rifles, Daystate has installed a HUMA. It's worth noting that the regulator is adjustable without degassing if you want to turn it up, but if you want to reduce the pressure, then you must degas the rifle first.

They have also upgraded the valve system with a fast-flow version that improves both shot count and efficiency. The valves on the sub-12ft/ lbs model differ from the FAC version, but both valves utilise a titanium valve pin, which is much lighter than a steel pin, allowing the valve to open and close more quickly, speeding up the cycling time and improving overall efficiency.

Barrel options

As with the choice of air reservoir, there are numerous barrel configurations available, too. The base model that I'm testing here comes fitted with a 17" Lothar Walther barrel, but there are also 23" and 28" barrels available. If you're a high-power slugger, then there's a slug-specific barrel available,

too. All of the barrel configurations come fully shrouded, and there is a 0.5" UNF thread at the end if you want to add a silencer to the setup.

The base model barrel doesn't come fitted with a barrel tensioner as standard, and that's purely to keep the price down, but you can purchase one as an optional extra. Needless to say, the models above the baseline price point do come with a barrel tensioner fitted, which helps improve barrel rigidity and, therefore, accuracy. All the barrels are fast-changing, so you can swap out calibres in an instant.

Furniture store

The Blackwolf is available in three stock options, including the carbon grey baseline model, a grey laminate and, of course, natural walnut, all supplied by Minelli. There is also a tactical platform available for those who like the military look.

Daystate has spent a lot of time ensuring that this new stock design is optimal. In fact, it is one of the lowest-profile stocks that Daystate has ever designed. This low profile helps with

stability and manoeuvrability, as well as helping to reduce the chances of canting.

The ambidextrous cheekpiece is heightadjustable, as is the butt pad, and there is ample chequering on the ergonomically crafted pistol grip and fore-end. On the underside of the foreend, there is an M-LOK rail fitting, which sits flush to the stock when you're shooting freehand, but also allows you to add a bipod, too.

Fully adjustable trigger

It goes without saying that Daystate has designed a new trigger system as part of this project, and it's a really exciting concept. It is, in fact, a removable trigger 'cassette' system. This means you can purchase additional trigger units and set each one up differently, depending on how you're shooting and your preferred trigger settings, for example, in competition or when hunting.

Each cassette unit allows you to adjust virtually every aspect of the trigger, with no fewer than eight points of adjustment. These

include first-stage travel, first-stage weight, trigger position, trigger shoe position, and second-stage travel to break. It comes set with a short first stage and around a 10oz pull weight, but it can be altered from around 8oz to 3.5lbs.

There's an AR-15-type safety lever immediately above and behind the trigger. Again, the safety lever is connected on both sides of the rifle, with a lever on either side for those who shoot left-handed.


When in the 'Safe' position, it sits neatly parallel to the stock, out of the way, but when you flip it down to 'Fire', the blade of the lever is directly where your trigger finger is in the shooting position, so you can feel that the rifle is 'Live'.

Side-lever action

The Blackwolf's side-lever is nothing short of superb. It's a really chunky biathlon-type lever that has been designed to be used with the rifle mounted for continuous shooting. The lever itself has a very short stroke and requires absolutely no effort at all to cock. Even pushing the lever forward barely







registers resistance, and that's a testament to the quality of design and nanometre tolerance of the pellet probe, which glides the pellet from the magazine into the breech in a single, fluid motion.

The other great thing about this particular side-lever is that it can be changed from left to right in a matter of minutes by the user.

The single-piece block that the action is built around features a built-in split Picatinny rail on top, which has 20 MOA of adjustment built into it – perfect for both sub-12ft/lbs and FAC shooters.

As I have already alluded to, there are no fewer than 60 optional extras currently listed on Daystate's website, including spring power tuning kits for HP (FAC) models, a biathlon cocking lever, M-LOK Picatinny rails, extra magazines, calibre changing kits, and a barrel tensioner, to name just a few.

On target performance

I won't bore you with just how exceptionally good this rifle is in the field. It's insanely accurate out to 30m, and just as accurate when you decide to push your limits out to 50m or more. The only thing that's going to let you down at such distances is yourself. The rifle is more than capable of producing 5p-sized groups at over 50m in sub-12ft/lbs!

It really is an absolute piece of manufacturing magnificence, and whether you're a top-end competition shooter, a club ranger or a hunter, this rifle truly does it all, with the style and performance that only Daystate can provide. GM

Buck 713 Ruckus and Stinger folding knives

For 2025, Buck has added a couple of very good quality folding knives to its range: the Ruckus and the Stinger.

As well as a flippertype opener, both knives feature drop-point D2 steel blades with ball bearings on the hinges for smooth operation. This type of steel is known for its good edge retention and hardness, making it a great choice for a hard-wearing knife.

Once open, the blade is held securely by a framelock mechanism, which engages automatically as the blade reaches its fully open position. When closed, the blade is held firmly in place, and a fair amount of force is needed on the large flipper to release it. Deep jimping on the flipper's top edge ensures a secure grip, making it easier to overcome the retention when opening the blade. This is a valuable feature that makes one-handed operation easy and ensures rapid blade deployment.

Another common feature on both knives is the large, removable, and reversible pocket clip. This allows both left-handed and right-handed users to carry the knife on their belt and deploy it effectively, or take the clip off completely to make the knife slimmer.

713 Ruckus

The Buck 713 Ruckus is a large folder with a 3.5" long blade that's 0.13" thick, and





it has a very slight recurve, making it very effective at cutting. The blade also has a very nice non-reflective stonewashed finish and a small area of jimping right at the back of the spine. The handle is made of anodised aluminium, which is a very tough and resilient material, and the ergonomic design makes for an effective and comfortable hold. The closed length is just under 5" and the weight is just over 5oz, so this is a nice, light, and compact tool.

714 Stinger

The Buck 714 Stinger is the smaller of the two new knives, with a 3" blade that is still 0.13" thick, and therefore has the same rigidity and strength as the Ruckus. The handle is anodised aluminium with a carbonfibre inlay, which gives it a really nice look and feel, and although smaller than the Ruckus, the knife still feels good in your hand and is easy to grip. Both of the handle materials are particularly tough, and they are also very easy to clean and maintain.

Weighing just under 4oz and measuring 4.25" when closed, this is a compact and practical tool that's easy to carry and is wellsuited to general use.

Conclusion

These are both great folding knives, and the build quality and choice of materials are typical of the high standards that you get from Buck, who provides a lifetime warranty for all their products, which is reassuring. As soon as you take the knives out of the box, the look, finish, and feel are impressive, and you know you are getting a lot for your money. **GM**

Haenel's Jaeger NXT straight-pull rifle is now available with a synthetic stock, complementing the previously offered laminate options. This update makes the rifle even more appealing to the UK market, where weather conditions can be unpredictable. I hunted with one in Sweden late last year, where it rained almost continuously, and can personally vouch for its corrosion resistance.

Barrel and action

Haenel uses a cold hammer-forged barrel with a 1:11" twist rate on the .308 Winchester model. The only other calibre currently available is .30-06, although the range is expected to expand in the future. The barrel measures 20" (510mm) in length and is 18mm in diameter just behind the muzzle. It features an easily removable foresight and thread cap. A robust rear sight sits at the reinforce, and the barrel is genuinely free-floated within the fore-end.

While the action appears cylindrical from above, it actually has a V-shaped underside to fit snugly into the stock inlet. The closed-top design enhances stiffness, and twin Picatinny bases are machined directly into the steel for straightforward scope mounting.

Innovative bolt mechanism

The standout feature of the NXT is its straight-pull bolt system, operated via a swinging handle on the right side of the receiver. With the bolt removed, you can observe the bevel gear mechanism beneath the rear shroud that controls the locking system. The bolt body is conventional in appearance, featuring three locking lugs, a single extractor claw, and a spring-loaded ejector plunger.

Although it locks into the receiver like a traditional three-lug turn bolt action, the internal gearing allows the bolt shaft to rotate relative to the visible shroud without requiring the user

to lift the handle. Instead, a simple rearward pull cycles the action, a clever and efficient design.

To chamber a round, close the bolt normally. The cartridge is stripped silently from the detachable, twin-column five-round magazine and fed into the chamber. The bolt then clicks shut. However, the rifle is not cocked until you push the bolt handle forward a few additional degrees. Only then is the rifle ready to fire, with the lugs rotated into battery and the firing pin free to strike forward.

After firing, the bolt handle unlocks automatically. Simply pull it rearward to eject the brass and repeat the cycle. If you choose not to fire, you can easily neutralise the action by clicking the bolt handle slightly rearward to de-cock the firing pin. To unload safely, press the lever on the rear of the bolt shroud, and the bolt can be drawn back. This all sounds far more complicated than it is, and the mechanism can be operated quickly under pressure or slowly and quietly when stealth is important, which is a rare but valuable feature in a straight-pull rifle.

Primary extraction

It's important to note that Haenel also avoids another straight-pull Achilles' heel: it has strong primary extraction to break the fired case away from its tapered chamber walls. Some straight-pulls are equally capable in this regard, but a few can be problematic if you're using particularly fierce ammunition or leave a round chambered in a hot barrel for more than a few seconds.

Magazine and trigger

The magazine is easy to top-load, thanks to its twin-column design, and it locks securely into the rifle using a release catch underneath. It inserts and ejects cleanly, without any rattle or fuss, and performs quietly during operation.

















The single-stage trigger is not externally adjustable, but it is crisp and intuitive in use.

The review rifle's trigger broke at 750g (26oz), with no detectable creep and minimal overtravel, which is ideal for precision shooting.

For the all-weather hunters among you, there is also a spacious trigger guard for gloved fingers.

Stock design

The synthetic stock is injection-moulded, with tactile copolymer rubber inlays along the fore-end and grip, providing superb wetweather handling. The fore-end features a subtle beavertail profile with space for finger placement and a sling stud at the tip.

The grip has an open radius, and the standard length of pull is 14.5" (368mm). Alternative butt pads are available to adjust the fit, though the factory setup was perfect for me in light summer clothing. The medium-firm recoil pad is well-contoured, particularly at the heel, enabling a smooth, fast mount, which is perfect for a rifle designed for quick handling.

The height-adjustable cheekpiece is springloaded for easy repositioning, and it is controlled via a push-button release on the right side. It has a slim comb that aligns naturally beneath the cheekbone, avoiding any lateral jaw displacement. Notably, the stock is acoustically dampened, meaning it's quiet during use and resistant to the hollow echo common in less refined polymer designs.

Internal construction

Removing the rifle from the stock requires loosening two Allen screws on the underside, which span the magazine well. These screws are supported by rolled steel pillars to prevent compression, while the stock itself is also internally reinforced with a lattice structure that ensures rigidity. This level of injection moulding complexity clearly signals to the informed eye just how much investment has gone into the tooling required to produce a serious contender, rather than just a Walmart rack filler.

The action's V-shaped base fits precisely into the inlet, with no detectable stress when re-tightened, which is an excellent indicator of consistent bedding and reliable return-to-zero performance.

For those wanting to add a fore-end stud for a bipod, Haenel has thoughtfully reinforced the tip internally with a pre-formed anchor point. You simply drill and fit the appropriate hardware, with no need for aftermarket guesswork.

Range performance

I first shot a Jaeger NXT at a shooting cinema in Sweden, and at 25m it unsurprisingly produced

ragged single-hole groups with .30-cal bullets. Back in the UK, testing at 100m confirmed consistent sub-MOA three-shot groups. The barrel cooled well on a 15°C day, showing no noticeable thermal drift over a 10-shot rapid-fire string.

I also borescoped the barrel and found a cleanly manufactured unit with very few discrepancies. For those who have never done this, the first look inside some factory barrels can be quite a shock, with poor crowns, rough chambering, and untidy throats not uncommon. Thankfully, there were no such issues from Haenel. The surface texture of the bore also made cleaning easier, and I believe copper bullets are much less forgiving of poorly finished bores than jacketed lead ones.

At the range

Shooting from front and rear bags, the rifle felt stable and repeatable, which is ideal for accuracy testing. Recoil was linear and controlled, especially with the Haenel sound moderator fitted, with minimal muzzle rise and no harshness. I also shot the rifle from quad sticks at 150m in a simulated hunting scenario, and it delivered tight results with no surprises.

The Haenel Jaeger NXT is a unique and characterrich rifle that doesn't compromise on performance. It's accurate, stable, and free from mechanical quirks. The magazine system is excellent, and after 60 rounds, the action ran even more smoothly with reduced effort to lock and cock the bolt.

Feel the rifle

Ergonomically, this is one of the best stock designs I've used, as it's quiet, solid, grippy, and

remains comfortable even in cold, wet conditions. The rifle handles instinctively and doesn't leech warmth from your hands. The fore-end doesn't need to be muscled into control, and the grip offers assured purchase with minimal effort.

Conclusion

The Jaeger NXT is a clever and capable rifle that's ready for real-world hunting scenarios, and it's built for shooters who value refinement without sacrificing durability. The label "straight-pull" suggests a rifle focused on speed, but it's important to recognise that some models sacrifice functionality simply to fit the name. In contrast, a very small number of truly capable rifles—this one included, in my opinion—offer practical ergonomics and precision at realistic hunting ranges, without the drawbacks often associated with non-traditional actions. If I'm honest, only three straight-pull action designs strike me as genuinely outstanding; the rest are little more than pretenders chasing marketing hype. This is definitely one of the former. GM

> PSE has been making carbon-fibre stocks since 2008, and the company has continued to innovate. The Evolution stock is designed to be the ultimate lightweight option. Its key distinction from other stock designs lies in the use of two carbon shells moulded together—the inlet and external surfaces—with an internal longitudinal skeleton. A monocoque exoskeleton like a beetle, yet with a chassis/skeleton too, like a mammal. A modern monocoque is more like an eggshell in that the outer shape/ form is the stiffening structure, and although more complicated to make, it allows the overall dimensions of the structure to be larger and stiffer, yet thinner, allowing optimised mechanical properties for the same mass of material.

PSE's Evolution stock seeks to combine conventional hunting rifle ergonomics with a blend of the more tactical type stocks of the 2000s, with a vertical pistol grip and flat underside design.

Adjustability

The Single Hand Quick Release (SHQR) cheekpiece is height adjustable via a low-profile knob that does not snag on clothing or foliage, and it can be swapped to either the left or right side.

The cheekpiece is spring-loaded and rises to meet your face, and once in position, simply re-tighten the aluminium dial. It slopes slightly downwards towards the action, meaning that under recoil, as the gun moves backwards, it fractionally withdraws from your cheekbone to reduce the transfer of recoil to your head and face.


Spacer system

The butt shows a foam rubber recoil pad secured by two screws, and the length of pull measured 13" (330mm). Three 9mm spacers were supplied, and more are available. The spacers are a relatively hard rubber material that also helps to minimise recoil transfer, and there is no hollow resonance throughout the stock due to its rigid foam core.

The butt has a flat underside, giving it stability on a rear bag, and it offers effortless, intuitive elevation control when using either a soft bag or a clenched fist.



















The pistol grip features a slight pentagonal palm swell, which is advertised as enhancing grip in the same way as a tennis racket, and although it feels tactile and provides assured control, it remains relatively slim.

Options

PSE's Internal Carbon Skeleton (ICS) means that the stock weighs in at just 700g (24oz) as standard, but there are many options. It's available with either a standard varmint or extralarge barrel channel inlet, without compromising rigidity. Unlike some stocks, it cannot be milled out to a larger size later, so it's wiser to choose the larger option from the outset.

The stock features a sharkskin texture on the grip and fore-end, providing plenty of mechanical grip, although this can be omitted if preferred when specifying your build.

The options are extensive, and the website details all the possibilities for sling studs and accessories. I opted for the standard lateral QD flush cups, and rather than a conventional front sling stud for a bipod, I had a Picatinny rail fitted to accommodate a Tier-One A-Tac, keeping with the lightweight carbon theme. PSE can also install Spartan's magnetic bipod cups if desired.

This stock was designed for my custom .223 rifle, which features a relatively modest 20" varmint-profile barrel, making it more suited to foxing and general varminting than stalking. To suit this purpose, I added an underside Arca rail to match my tripod head. I also fitted a shorter section of Picatinny rail to the left side of the fore-end for an IR illuminator, allowing instant access with my leading hand.

Bedding

The construction is incredibly neat, with a beautiful finish to all the surfaces. The inlet is impeccable, and if you opt for a Tikka inlet, then the barrelled action will fit immediately, although PSE advises it is better to have a bedding job done for the Remington 700 inlet. I would also say that no matter how good a stock is, epoxy bedding removes any chance of stress application.

The underside inlet is compatible with various PSE bottom metal options, and I opted for a standard aluminium unit compatible with AICS magazines.

It fits perfectly in position, and PSE advises how to optimise the release catch for certain magazine types, which can vary slightly. There is ample space for the trigger mechanism, which can be any Remington 700-compatible design.

Although I plan to have the stock bedded, I initially shot it in its bare format, which, on a light-recoiling .223, showed no real disadvantage. Even so, I will be bedding it for my own peace of mind.

Handling dynamics

The surface texture of the stock is incredibly tactile, providing assured grip in all areas. I particularly liked the light, slim and easily adjustable cheekpiece, which ensures excellent scope alignment. I plan to add a couple more length-of-pull spacers to suit my height, but recoil transfer was already linear, with no tendency for torque to disturb the rifle's aim point when cycling the action. The recoil pad anchors securely in the shoulder pocket without feeling spongy. Crucially, the rifle can be controlled precisely with the support hand under the butt for fine elevation adjustment, and regardless of shoulder pressure against the recoil pad, the fore-end remains completely rigid, with generous freefloat clearance to prevent zero shift. I also appreciated the underside ARCA rail for tripod use, and with flush cups fitted, the rifle was relatively light and comfortable to carry. The underside Picatinny rail provided a solid and reliable mounting point for the bipod.

Conclusion

The PSE Evolution is a fine stock, and I really like the intelligent design approach of an internal skeleton and external exoskeleton, combined with the moulded inlet rather than machined inlet, which, although more expensive, optimises the true capability of carbon fibre. It was great with a short varmint barrel but would complement an ultralight carbon-barrelled action to create a true featherweight rifle. GM

Mark Underwood takes a look at how powder measures have developed over the years



The powder charge is one of the more critical elements in reloading because it directly influences the muzzle velocity and chamber pressure, and the consistency of the charges dictates how consistently rounds perform. The methods by which powder charges are measured have not really changed, with them all being either volume or weight-based, but the equipment, the accuracy, and the consistency have certainly improved.

Early powder measures

Back in the 1980s, the Lee Precision Auto-Disk Powder Measure was the then state-of-the-art tool of choice. It came with a set of six disks, each holding six cavities of different sizes corresponding to different charge weights. Measuring charge 'weights' by volume is a very accurate and reliable method. The actual weight being discharged by this type of measure does need checking with a scale, but once you know the weight,

you can rely on each cavity you are using to keep dropping that same charge pretty consistently. This was a basic tool, with a cast alloy body, and it relied on the underside of the plastic hopper to 'cut' the powder charge off as the disk passed under it. This friction led to wear after a few years, and other metal parts also started to rub on each other and stick.

The next step in the evolution of my own powder measuring was the Lee Precision Pro Auto-Disk Powder Measure. This is a more modern version of its predecessor, and it addressed several issues. The body is Tefloncoated, to ensure smoother operation,

and an elastomer wiper cleanly wipes across the powder charge without friction or powder cutting. This version gives better and more consistent powder charges, operates more smoothly, and does not seem to wear.

Advanced options

In the 1990s, Lee introduced their Perfect Powder Measure, the first model to eliminate charge disks in favour of a single, adjustable cavity. The cavity is micrometer-adjusted, with a meaningful scale marked in cubic centimetres, and once set, it can be locked with a locking ring so it does not slip out of adjustment.

When the measure is operated, the cavity is moved under the feed from the hopper and filled with powder. As the mechanism then rotates back, cutting off the powder supply from the hopper, it is moved to discharge powder into the case. This is a good design, giving consistent powder charges, and it is easily adjustable. To set it, you simply discharge powder, weigh it, and adjust the micrometre until you get the desired weight repeatedly.

Not a company to sit still, Lee
Precision then introduced their Deluxe
Perfect Powder Measure, which took
the single-cavity powder measure
up a good few notches. A precision
die-cast body, a brass drum that is
totally anti-static, a soft elastomer
wiper, and a quick-change hopper with
a powder cut-off were all introduced
to make the tool smoother and
better. A larger and easier-to-read
micrometre was also added. A very
heavy and stable stand was introduced
at the same time, and it is well worth
purchasing to support this tool.

Both of these micrometeradjustable measures represent an improvement on the fixed-cavity designs.

The next powder measure to appear

was the Lee Deluxe Auto-Drum Powder

A bit of both

Measure, which combined features of the earlier tools. It used interchangeable drums, similar to the cavities in previous models, but each one was also adjustable, like the cavity on the micrometeradjustable measures. The drums are adjusted with a small key, with approximately 1/10 of a grain increments, and, combined with a scale, setting them is a fairly quick process. If you label

each drum with the powder type and weight they are set to, you can swap them over relatively easily, making calibre changes very swift.

This is a case-activated measure, like some of its predecessors, and it proved to be a real pain to set up on the press and get it to discharge powder consistently. Balancing how deep it sat in the expander die with the amount of movement needed to actuate the measure fully was difficult, and getting the measure to move through the full range of movement required without excessively belling out the case mouth took a long time. It went back in the box several times before I got it set up correctly. The latest version has a red anodised swivel adapter, and this may exist to alleviate this issue.

If you take the time to set this measure up as you want it, it is very good.

Hornady options

Hornady products are heavily built and incredibly durable, so they are a good

choice, if not a bit more expensive. The Hornady Lock-N-Load Powder Measure is one such tool. It uses interchangeable and adjustable metering inserts, similar in principle to the metering drums on the Lee Deluxe Auto-Drum, but they are made of steel and incorporate a substantial and effective locking ring to prevent them from slipping out of adjustment. Features like a push-button release on the metering inserts, tolerances of 0.002", and a powder baffle to regulate powder flow make this a very accurate and consistent powder measure.

High-tech

Thanks entirely to the generosity of the team at Edgar Brothers, a Hornady Auto Charge Pro has been added to the reloading bench. This is an electronic, fully automated powder measure, which trickles powder extremely accurately into a powder pan on a scale. The speed and accuracy of the scale are fully controllable, and you can set and store charge weights in its memory. Having a scale to hand that automatically discharges a powder charge each time you put

the pan onto it is really handy, and it does make the whole reloading process smoother and quicker. If affordable, this is a really good tool to have.


Conclusion

With the exception of the earliest Auto-Disk measure, all of these products are still available, and they all do a decent job of measuring powder. Wherever you choose to join the powder measure journey, be it based on cost, accuracy, or the speed of reloading you want to achieve, there is an option that will meet your needs. GM



SMART OPTION

Jules Whicker tests the P650 and reckons Pixfra's Al upgrades make their Pegasus Pro thermal riflescopes an even smarter buy

> Thomas Jacks is best known as Pulsar's UK distributor, but, recognising that not everyone has the budget for a premium European product, they have worked with Chinese company Pixfra to create a range of devices that deliver great performance at more accessible price points. Since their launch at last summer's Game Fair, Pixfra's Pegasus thermal riflescopes have done precisely that.

Moreover, whereas the initial Pegasus models have now been replaced by the upgraded "Pro" series, prices have remained exactly the same, at £1,489.95 (P435P), £1,689.95 (P450P),

£1,869.95 (P635P), and £2,069.95 (P650P), making them even more exceptional value.

So, what do you get for just over two grand? Quite a lot, as it turns out.

Build, handling, and feel

The P650P features a 50mm f/1.0 Germanium objective lens paired with a 640x512/12µm thermal sensor, delivering a native magnification of 2.78x. Overall dimensions (420.5 x 77.5 x 74mm) and weight (960g) place it shoulder-to-shoulder with Pulsar's Thermion line. That's not the only resemblance, as it mounts using standard 30mm rings, meaning no special hardware is required.

Build quality is excellent. The focusing rings for the ocular and objective lenses are nicely stiff, smooth-turning and backlash-free. The objective lens cover, which folds flat against the scope, has the rigidity of aluminium. The rubberised buttons on the ocular bell offer just the right amount of resistance, and the multifunction top turret turns and clicks with controllable ease. The whole scope

carries an IP67 weatherproof rating and a 6,000-joule shock resistance.

Controls and interface

The main controls are split between the ocular bell and the saddle. On the bell, you get four buttons: power, image capture, palette change, and – unusually – a "range-setting" button (more on that later). The central power button is backlit (red for charging, green for active/charged). You can dim or disable this via the menu if needed.

The main menu system is accessed via the top turret, which scrolls and clicks to navigate and select. The interface isn't entirely uniform; sometimes clicking confirms, and sometimes it cycles. It's worth spending some time learning the layout. Once mastered, it's fast and intuitive.

Recording and media

Formats are JPG/MP4, at 640x512px.
A short press of the image button takes a snapshot, while a three-second press starts or stops video recording.

You can't pause mid-recording, but you can take stills, which is a nice touch. Audio recording is also available, and the recoil-activated video capture worked well with a .223. It didn't trigger on my sub-12ft/ lbs air rifle, which was expected.

Power and runtime

Power comes from a built-in pair of 3,200mAh Li-ion cells, giving around nine hours of runtime. There's also a compartment for a CR123A battery under the left-hand turret, though, curiously, the scope won't boot from the CR123A alone if the internal cells are flat. The Pegasus will run without a CR123A, however, so that's what I went with. I also extended the runtime by activating the auto shut-down function and by using the USB-C port to top up from a power bank or the car when necessary.

Image quality and processing

The P650P's standout feature is its AI-powered image processing, dubbed PIPS 2.0. This is one of two major

upgrades over the original Pegasus range; the other being a not-unrelated improvement in claimed NETD, from ≤30 to ≤18mK. PIPS 2.0 automatically optimises brightness, contrast and sharpness in real-time, making manual tweaks largely redundant. Initially, I played with the manual image settings (available via the quick-access menu), but increasingly left things to PIPS. When you're used to tinkering, going hands-free feels weird at first, but quickly becomes liberating.

Also available via the quick menu are two primary imaging modes:
Standard and Forest. Standard offers a more nuanced, lower-contrast image, whereas Forest amps up the tips of the temperature peaks, making warm-blooded animals stand out more distinctly, especially in cluttered backgrounds.

Native "1x" magnification is actually 2.78x, with digital zoom at "2x", "4x", and "8x" levels, giving a top end of 22.24x. Ordinarily, I avoid digital zoom above "2x" due to the degradation of image quality.



However, as you zoom in, PIPS 2.0 actively reinterprets the available sensor data, recreating a smooth and detailed image. That said, thermal imagery is always the system's best guess at reality, so shoot within its limits as well as yours.

You can also overlay compass bearing, pitch and roll indicators. These require calibration by rotating the scope through 360 degrees on all three axes. It took me a few tries to get a clean reading, so don't assume it's right out of the box.

Zeroing and reticle options

The Pegasus lacks the app-driven ballistic profiles of some competitors, but it does support five "groups", each with five individual "profiles".

To start, choose a profile number, reticle type, colour (red, green, white), and preset range (50m, 100m, etc.). From there, you fine-tune by entering the actual distance and

using a freeze-frame system to shift the reticle to the point of impact.

The process is straightforward enough, but here are three tips to save time and ammunition: first, boresight the rifle by centring the target through the bore and aligning the scope's image accordingly, which also helps with safety; second, start at a close distance where a hit is guaranteed to ensure the first shot provides useful feedback; and third, keep it simple by doing your familiarisation with a .177 sub-12ft/lbs air rifle in the garden, where any mistakes cost pennies rather than pounds.


Thomas Jacks includes adhesive thermal targets with the scope. These are excellent at longer ranges but a bit overpowered up close. For most thermal zeroing, I take a supply of 2cm tinfoil squares, a Pritt Stick, and a pack of Thermbright stickers for extra reflectivity when needed. Also good is a target backer that retains

heat for long enough to let me enter the zeroing mode and freeze the target image (another skill to practise before you fire your first shot!).

To zero, fire a shot, enter freeze-frame mode, and move the cursor to the impact point using the scroll wheel. Click to change axis, click again to confirm, and the main reticle jumps to the new zero. You get a zoomed PiP window for fine adjustment, and the click values are shown clearly on the screen. It's worth firing a confirmation shot, but if the first shot was good and your adjustments were precise, two rounds are usually enough.

Setting multiple ranges

Planning to do some ratting and feral clearance around the farmyard, I wanted to make use of the rangesetting button by inputting zero points for my sub-12ft/lbs .177 air rifle at 5m increments from 15m to 45m. That meant creating five









points in the "A" profile and a further two points in the "B" profile. For each point I created, I logged the X and Y coordinates, entering the numbers from the previous point as my baseline for the next. This kept all my shots on the paper and gave me minimal corrections to make. Keep your coordinates safe in case you ever need to do a factory reset!

Now, each press of the rangesetting button gives me my next zero
point, showing its name on the display.
This also revealed the five-point limit
as a positive, since it reduced the
scroll-through time if I "missed my
stop" in my enthusiasm to engage
the target! Also good is having to
enter the menu to change profiles,
as this stopped me from accidentally
selecting the wrong ballistic
dataset in the heat of the action.

Retro perhaps, but the dedicated button gives this kind of point-bypoint ballistic mapping a fresh lease of life. Nevertheless, in this era of integrated LRF/ballistic systems, they are perhaps overdue in releasing firmware incorporating a Pulsar-style ballistic solver with dial-in ranging, and new LRF-Pegasus models must surely be in the pipeline, too.

Practical performance

Pegasus/.177 combination proved absolutely deadly on rats and ferals alike. I didn't shoot any foxes or deer with it, but I was able to detect and identify both with ease, and even see cleaned antlers at 150m. Above all, thanks to PIPS 2.0, the scope was super-easy to run and delivered the best digital zoom experience yet.

Verdict

The Pixfra Pegasus P650P is not a "budget" scope in the patronising sense; it's a well-engineered device that makes thermal more accessible.

It features a high-resolution sensor, long battery life, robust construction, and AI-driven image processing that makes digital zoom genuinely useful while reducing the need for manual adjustment. The controls are largely intuitive, and the combination of a simple zeroing process and a dedicated zero-point selection button adds speed and versatility in the field. Limitations? No ballistic calculator, quirky power management, and slightly inconsistent menu logic. But these are minor when measured against the performance on offer.


For shooters seeking highend thermal imaging without emptying their bank account, the P650P deserves a very close look. It's not just "good for the money"; it's good, full stop. GM



Chris Parkin compares two Leupold scopes during a driven hunt in Germany, putting their real-world performance to the test

A friend and I were invited to Germany for a local driven boar and deer hunt near Frankfurt, and as it was a chance to use my own rifle for a change, I asked Viking Arms for a couple of Leupold scopes to use. I was using a Savage Impulse Mountain Hunter in 7mm PRC, and James used his Sauer 100 in .308. When the scopes arrived, we chose a lucky dip, and I ended up with the VX-6 1-6x24, while James got the MK4 HD with a 1-4.5x24 specification.

Dot or not

The key to boar shooting is having an optic with low magnification and a broad field of view, but I firmly believe in the value of being able to zoom in. On many occasions, I've had to frustratingly decline shot opportunities at more distant, static quarry when using simple red dot sights. These have their place, and in very closequarters, fast-fire scenarios they can offer a slight advantage, but I prefer the flexibility of a variable optic. Both scopes were press samples without boxes, although the VX-6 came with its flip-up aluminium lens caps. Both featured 30mm tubes, so we mounted and zeroed them independently at 50m in preparation for the trip.

Clicks and FOV

Leupold offers many variations of their optics, including different reticles and turret click values, but these two both featured 1cm@100m clicks. They featured matte black anodising, recessed objective lenses, ample tube space for mounting, and very similar maximum fields of view: 118.8ft at 100 yards on the lowest magnification for the MK4, and 120.9ft at the same distance on 1x magnification for the VX-6.

The differences

The VX-6 has a broader 6x zoom ratio. The magnification control collar is ribbed for acceptable grip, with a small wing at about 2.75x magnification for easy control with cold hands or gloves. The ocular lens has a fast-focus eyepiece for immediate reticle clarity, and the illumination control is on the left-hand side of the central saddle. This is the FireDot model, so a press of the dial's centre initiates illumination, with subsequent presses to alter the intensity. At peak brightness, the dot flashes, so further presses step things back down. A long hold turns the reticle off, and the red dot itself is a precise, tiny spot within the Duplex reticle's arms. The reticle is in the second focal plane (SFP), with eight illumination intensity settings which offer a crisp aim point without any light bleeding out.

If you need to take on a longer shot, the VX-6 is equipped with a CDS dial featuring a zero stop and extensive elevation adjustment, allowing the rifle to be quickly switched into a secondary (deerstalking) mode at 4x or 6x magnification. This enables precise daylight shots at extended distances within realistic hunting limits. The CDS turret is fast to operate, with a quiet yet clearly defined silver locking button that permits elevation correction. From a 50m zero, there were still 140 clicks (14 Mils) of additional travel available.

The Mk4 alternative route

The Mk4's elevation turret is slightly larger at 38mm in diameter rather than 32mm, and it features a similar locking button, although the engraved markings are slightly bolder, which I prefer. These align with the internal TMR reticle, which also has an 8-stage illuminated dot that appears just a fraction bolder and more prominently overlaid on the mildot reticle markings. These markings need to be dialled to 4.5x magnification to provide correct subtension on target, as this is a second focal plane layout. This makes good sense if you are planning to take longer-range precision shots, as maximum magnification is where you need to be on the 4.5x zoom range.

The windage dial is capped, rather than the external unit of the VX-6, but I don't see this as a downside. It's a hunting scope for large quarry at realistic ranges,





and not really a long-distance dialler needing wind correction.

The scopes were mounted on two entirely different rifles with Picatinny rails, and although they offer similar elevation travel specifications on paper, this one showed 19 Mils of travel beyond the 50m zero when set up on the Sauer. This was a unique result caused by the inclined rail.

So, choose

Well, as it happens, neither of us had the chance to shoot a boar, but the trip certainly gave us plenty of time to contemplate the optics, particularly with the visible but restricted roe deer in the area.

We swapped rifles for contrast on day three and, if I'm being brutally honest, we both preferred the Mk4 for several reasons. Firstly, the magnification difference didn't matter much for the likely engagement distances and typical quarry size. Secondly, although the field of view

was technically different, the visual difference was negligible in real-world use. Thirdly, we both favoured the larger elevation dial and the Mk4's throw lever, which proved quicker and easier to operate with numb hands in the -2°C conditions.

Both scopes delivered superb image quality in the daylight conditions we experienced. Low light wasn't a factor on this type of hunt. Perhaps most importantly, we both liked the slightly heavier reticle and the intensity of the Mk4's red dot.

Spending nine hours with little to do but look through an optic, even when the quarry isn't quite what you're after, gives you time to reflect and really focus on every sound and movement. In fairness, neither of us had any doubts about our scopes. They had been easy to mount and zero confidently. It is simply a reminder that you do not always get a shot. But at least, with a bit of magnification, if a deer steps




out below the skyline, you might just get a shot while waiting for that more elusive and challenging boar! GM

> MTM doesn't deal in thin, brittle or easily broken cases; they have produced some of the toughest gear in my armoury, and their latest large rolling cases are no disappointment.

The Mule and Tactical Rifle Crates are essentially identical, except the former comes in a coyote/ buff colour and the latter in a grey/green. Their differences become apparent once the lids are opened, revealing different internal components.

Similarities

The external dimensions are 1105x297x292mm (43.5x11.7x11.5") with two wheels at one end. There are twin carry handles, with the one at the opposite end to the wheels becoming the grip when rolling the case along behind you.

The injection-moulded trunks feature extensive three-dimensional reinforcement, with ribs and recesses that add

strength and rigidity, while also allowing cases to be stacked securely without the risk of sliding. There are four latches on the lids with padlock tabs for security, and the external surfaces are stippled to improve grip during handling.

Differences

When you open the cases, you'll notice a rubber O-ring seal around the rim that helps keep them watertight and dust-free, which is something pickup truck owners are likely to appreciate. Both crates feature segmented dividers, with a central 180mm (7") tall divider screwed in semi-permanently to reinforce the case, but this is where the differences become more apparent.

The Mule Crate includes a second divider that can be fitted into either the left or right slot, along with a smaller black tray that fills the opposite side. In contrast, the Tactical Rifle

Crate comes with all three dividers already in place and features a 50mm (2") deep, full-length tray above them, lined with eggbox foam. This will accommodate a rifle up to 1000x300x76mm (39.3x12x3"), and while a full-length centrefire may not fit, some ARs, airguns and rimfires might.

Tough stuff

I like the fact that the cases are totally dust and waterproof. I have filled the Mule crate with all my smaller range gear, including rest bags, rangefinders, ear defenders, spotting scope, etc. The Rifle crate is actually very handy for keeping my airgun gear in. When travelling to the range with

shorter .22 rimfires, I can confidently have everything in the case, knowing that whatever I drop in it will still be securely retained. The internal dimensions are 990x274x249mm (39x11x9.8") before segregation with the slot-in dividers.

MTM manufactures in the USA and takes great pride in its long-standing reputation. Although the products are a little more expensive, they stand the test of time, and these cases have proven tough, showing no signs of cracking even in colder weather. Lastly, they also make a great seat if you aren't too heavy! GM

With its elegant looks and superb handling, the Zoli One wins high praise from **Bruce Potts** in this detailed field review

I always appreciate the fine quality and handling of a Zoli shotgun the moment I pick one up. You can instantly feel the Italian shotgun maker's heritage, which dates back to 1845 when the Zoli family began crafting firearms in Magno Val Trompia, a region renowned for its artisanal excellence and as the home of Italy's finest gunmakers.

Zoli is one of those brands that seems to have flown under the radar, but for those who own one of their guns, it is a real find. A 10-year warranty is a good indication of the maker's confidence in the gun, and the range of models is also very good.

Today we're looking at the Zoli One, a model specifically designed in the UK for British shooting sports, offering understated elegance along with excellent handling and balance.

The company is also known for its obsession with ballistics (something I share), and their barrels are the crowning glory, delivering exceptional pattern performance and impressive terminal ballistics downrange, but more on that later.

At the heart of the gun is the Boss and inertia-type action, which combines excellent fit and finish with a level of performance that's hard to beat in the sub-£3,000 range.

This model is only available in 12-bore, with 29.5" barrels (as tested) or 32", and comes in both right and left-handed configurations. It has everything you need if you're serious about any form of shotgun shooting.

A lot to look at

The action is not only visually very appealing, especially to me, but also superbly engineered and machined. It starts as a forged steel monobloc-type design and is then crafted into the familiar Boss-type action configuration that forms the heart of the Zoli shotgun lines. What stands out first is the overall hot-blued action finish, which offers a more refined look than the usual polished coin silver. I much prefer this finish, being a rifleman, and to me, it is very elegant, looks expensive, and is far less gaudy than some other silvered designs.




The action also features fine, highly detailed scroll engraving on all sides, subtle enough not to draw too much attention, yet pleasing to the eye when it catches the light in the field. The trigger guard and tang are left unengraved and finished in a deep blue, giving a very understated and classic look, which I find rather appealing. The escutcheons and top lever have a complementary matted stippled finish, and the opening lever has chequering to the left side to facilitate easier opening. Up top is a Beretta-esque barrel selector (single and double dot) and manual safety with a nicely profiled, single raised lever and positive action.

When it comes to breaking the barrels, this Zoli opens easily, almost like a self-opener, yet still delivers a tight and secure lock-up on closure. As stated earlier, this is a Bosstype bolt-locking system with well-defined monoblocs and very positive engagement. Internally, it's an inertia system, so the recoil from the first barrel firing sets the hammer or striker for the second barrel, and as such, even with the light loads, reliability is no issue.

Zoli also allows a complete strip-down of the trigger unit, as it can be removed from the action for cleaning or safekeeping, which is a nice idea, but I'm not sure how many people would strip back this far. This Posi-Lock trigger system unit separates using the provided single screw, which also ensures the correct torque, and you are also supplied as standard with additional strikers and springs. The single-select trigger is equally good, almost rifle-like in its feel and lightness, and the second barrel is instantly on its way without a moment's hesitation.

Barrels

You only get a choice of 29.5", which is a bit unusual and was the length we had on test, or 32", but both feature a tapered rib width from 11.52mm to 7.25mm. There is a single white bead up front, and the barrels have a uniform, rich blue-





black colour along their entire length. The two barrels are silver-soldered together, with both the top and mid-ribs ventilated. This not only creates an attractive appearance but also helps to reduce the overall weight of the Zoli One, improving balance around the hinge pin. The design also aids air circulation, which in turn enhances cooling.


Internally, the bores are both 18.5mm in diameter, for improved ballistic performance, reduced felt recoil, and longevity. They are chambered for 3" cartridges and are superior steel shot proofed, so all or any cartridges can be shot with confidence in the Zoli One.

At the muzzle end, the flush-fit chokes are stainless steel, and five are provided (CYL, IM-CYL, MOD, IM-MOD and FULL). I fitted the ¼ and ½ chokes, as the others were mistakenly 20-bore. As usual, steel shot is only proofed up to ½ choke, which is the recommended maximum.

The furniture

"Just right" accurately sums up the stock on the Zoli One. It has been designed to resemble a Perazzi in gait, with a very comfortable, almost upright pistol grip and palm swell, adorned with machine-cut chequering. The fore-end has a round, generous profile and twin panels of the same cut chequering, and an all-metal, one-piece release lever snugly fitted to the underside.

The rear butt section has a slight cast and a relatively low comb, allowing for a fast and perfect sight picture down the rib. The thin black rubber, non-vented recoil pad offers good grip, and the 14.5" length of pull does not hinder quick shouldering. The hand-rubbed oil finish certainly lends an air of sophistication to the whole gun, and as Zoli uses Turkish walnut, the level of colour and grain/figuring is very pleasing and would equate to a Grade 3 in my book, although it is not specified. The overall design and ergonomics follow a European sporting-style stock, and as such, the gun performs just as well for clays as it does for game, or even vermin in my case.

In the field

The One mounts with ease despite its fairly chunky weight of 8lbs, thanks to its superb balance that makes it feel much lighter in the hand. Despite the shorter barrels on the test gun, it also pointed very naturally and swung remarkably freely and quickly, all while offering an uncluttered field of view around the tapered rib and bead.

In use, the recoil seemed very passive and straight in line, with no cheekpiece nibbling, and I could shoot this all day on, say, a simulated clay day.

With the ¼ and ½ chokes fitted, I shot at some pattern boards to ascertain, as usual, the number of pellets in the inner and outer sectors.

First up was Eley's DTL Gold cartridge, which is a good clay round that has always performed well in the past. With a loading of 28g of No.7.5 shot and a plastic wad, it managed a total of 310 pellets on the board, with a distribution of 101 inner hits and 209 outer hits to the 30" circle. The overall density was very good, with decent, even coverage that radiated out to the edges, with no holes – a good start.

Next up was another round from Eley that's aimed at the pigeon-shooting market: the Pigeon Select (30g, No.6). Again, the Zoli One was producing some spectacular patterns with the ½ choke. We had a perfectly symmetrical, even and dense pattern, with 107 inner hits and the remaining 141 pellets to the circumference – get through that total of 248 pellets, pigeons!

Last but not least was another great all-rounder and pigeon cartridge from Gamebore: Clear Pigeon (30g, No.6). The pattern was slightly more dispersed, but just as even and well distributed, with a healthy 79 inner hits and 131 outer hits. A good, hard-hitting loading that's also ideal for all manner of game and vermin.

Conclusion

Yes, Zoli is not mainstream, and for me, that's the bonus. Their guns are a bit more exclusive and desirable, and you will never regret picking one up and marvelling at its great balance and handling. Yes, £3,225 is a tad steep, but why not have something different, stand out from the crowd, and appreciate those marvellous patterns it throws downrange? GM

BRUCE POTTS PUTS HULL'S HIGH PHEASANT CARTRIDGES THROUGH A FULL FIELD AND PATTERN BOARD TEST AND FINDS THEM MORE THAN JUST A CLASSIC OPTION

> Hull's High Pheasant load comes in all shapes and sizes, but one of my favourites is the normal High Pheasant with a stiff 32g loading of larger No.5 shot, as I use these for squirrels and rabbits in thick cover - they work!

So, what have we got?

These High Pheasant cartridges use a 67mm case, CX primed, with a 16mm head, and although smaller than standard, they fit both classic and modern guns very well. They offer the performance of a 70mm load but are suitable for use in guns with a minimum 65mm chamber, i.e., older side-bysides, etc., so they are commonly the only cartridge needed for your Purdey or modern over-and-under.

This load is available in two pellet sizes, No.5 and No.6, and in two shot weights, 30 or 32g. It forms part of Hull's Drop Dead Gauge range of cartridges, offering fast and smooth shooting characteristics with moderate recoil while using biodegradable fibre wads to propel the hardened shot. This helps to reduce pellet deformation and delivers uniform, dense patterns at longer ranges.

The 30g load contains 234 pellets in No.5 shot and 297 in No.6, while the 32g load holds 250 and 317 pellets respectively. The 32g No.5s on test today are a really good, hardhitting round, and the larger pellets retain their energy at longer ranges.

There are two ways to think about shot size: larger pellets deliver more energy but create sparser patterns with fewer



hits, while smaller shot provides a denser pattern and more frequent strikes. What I like about the High Pheasant cartridge is that it always patterns well, so you have the advantage of a larger pellet and kinetic energy while not compromising on the pattern density. Let's see later in the tests.

By contrast, the High Pheasant Extreme cartridges were developed to use the Xtreme shot, which minimises pellet deformation for uniform, tighter patterns downrange, using powders that achieve 1450fps but without excessive pressure or recoil.

On closer inspection

Visually, the cartridges are very striking, featuring a royal blue plastic case and a high brass head with a well-defined rim, making it easy for extractor claws to remove them from hot chambers. Similarly, the six-star crimp closure at the end helps ballistics and impedes the ingress of inclement weather. All the relevant load details are spelt out in bold gold on the blue casing, and overall these are very smartly made 12-bore cartridges.

Inside, this load features a fibre wad only, marking it out as a game cartridge. Hull uses a material that is specially chosen for its consistent density and thickness, and it is treated to a waterproof, anti-tear treatment.

Hull's extensive knowledge and 75 years of experience with fibre wads ensure that



the antimony content also ensures the correct shot hardness is achieved for each loading.

over-powder cards provide an effective gas seal. Thus, you have an environmentally friendly choice of fibre wad that does not compromise performance.

Powder-wise, Hull's maxim of maximum performance, minimum pressure holds true for the High Pheasant loadings, as the propellants are engineered in terms of burn rate, pressure, and velocity to Hull's own formula. All are ignited by the CX range of primers, globally acknowledged as the most reliable and consistent on the market today, with rigorous quality control checks including primer sensitivity to the environment.

Tinally, the shot, despite not being Xtreme, displays very good uniformity and a consistently spherical shape. It was bright and showed little to no deformation around the edges. The raw material is derived from recycled sources, with controls for diametric tolerances ensuring that shot sizes are regular. The control of spherical tolerances allows the shot to fly truer, producing dense, regular patterns. Varying



Field test

As expected, the cartridge produced a lovely, neat and uniform spread with no clumping of shot. Also, the recoil was noticeably light for a 32g loading.

Using a ¼ choke, there were 228 No.5 pellet strikes on the board, which is a good result for that shot size based on previous experience. The spread included a generous 104 pellets in the inner 15" sector, with the remaining 124 in the outer 30". For a ¼ choke, the pattern was dense and evenly distributed from the centre outwards. Overall, a really good walked-up load on ¼ choke to drop but not "shred" game.


Similarly, the ½ choke produced some lovely patterns. We recorded an even denser distribution in the inner sector, with 167 of the total 280 pellets forming a concentrated swarm of No.5 shot exactly where it is most effective. The remaining 113 pellets were evenly spread across the outer sectors, and with this type of overall pattern, I would have no hesitation in using this load for longer-range vermin.

Conclusion

These High Pheasant cartridges are anything but standard in manufacture, design or performance. You can go for the Extreme version if you prefer, but the standard ones tested are just fine in my book. The High Pheasant range of cartridges, be it 12-bore or any other calibre in the range, offers topnotch performance you can rely on.

BANG GN TARGET

Rob Speed puts the all-new Blaser FBX
Sporting through its paces and discovers a shotgun that redefines balance, recoil control, and aesthetics



Anyone who has seen my YouTube channel knows I'm a huge Blaser fan. Whether it's the engineering, the looks, or the handling, these guns have it all. Blaser offers a more limited range of products than most other shotgun manufacturers, with only the F16 and the F3 available until recently. So, when I heard that the company was introducing a brand-new model to its shotgun line-up, I couldn't help but feel excited.

When I looked at the FBX Sporting for the first time, I immediately saw the resemblance to the F3 Professional. This made sense because the F3 has been tried and tested for over 20 years and has proved itself to be one of the most reliable shotguns on the market. The FBX receiver retains the same adjustable trigger and barrel selector, and I discovered that the internals are virtually the same as the F3, plus the reliable in-line hammer system remains. Interestingly, the FBX has a detachable trigger, unlike the F3 model, so if ever a mechanical problem were to arise, then a single screw can be removed to enable access to the internals.

Design and handling

The FBX's receiver clearly looks a lot different from the F3's, and some fantastic aesthetic and technical changes have been made. First, the heading of the stock protrudes over the action, and the fit of the fore-end to the metalwork is less square, which makes the FBX look a lot more modern. The raised sideplates on the receiver give it what I can only describe as an Italian look, a style that has proved successful for well-known Italian manufacturers and works just as well on this model.

The technical changes to the FBX receiver have resulted in this gun being like no other. It is wider and heavier than the F3 model, which allows a larger proportion of the gun's weight to sit lower and perfectly between the shooter's hands, resulting in better handling and reduced felt recoil. This, combined with the newly designed fore-end, sets it apart from most sporting shotguns on the market.

Altering the balance

Whereas most other modern sporting shotguns have the option of adjusting the balance by adding barrel weights, the FBX doesn't. The balancing weights sit in the bottom of the fore-end, which contributes greatly to the recoil coming low into the shoulder and reducing muzzle rise.

The four fore-end weights sit neatly in line with each other, and they can easily be removed if you require a faster-moving gun, but I would highly recommend leaving them in place, as this weighting system is one of the reasons why this gun handles so well. The shape of the fore-end is a hybrid between a beavertail and a rounded design, featuring a very subtle indentation for your fingertips to lie in. Overall, the fore-end is very comfortable.

Stock design and fit

The stock has a chunkier profile that goes well with the thicker receiver. The pistol grip is relatively large, with a healthy palm swell and a comfortable reach to the trigger. The shooter's hand sits straight due to the steep angle of the pistol grip and the deep cut-out in the stock. This



is extremely comfortable and doesn't put any strain on the wrist. It also helps the shooter maintain a firm and repeatable hand position for a consistent mount, reducing felt recoil and improving hit rates.

The wider surface area on the comb allows the shooter's cheek to sit comfortably on the stock, while the wider, soft recoil pad fits securely into the shoulder pocket, allowing its larger surface area to distribute recoil more effectively.

As for the stock dimensions of the FBX Sporting, there is a healthy cast, and the comb height sits relatively high, helping the shooter to acquire the target quickly and maintain focus on it. An adjustable stock option is also available, so if you need adjustments to your own measurements, this can be achieved. Within the stock is a balancing system, so weight can be added or taken away to suit your preference.

The FBX comes as standard with a strong, yet attractive grade 5 wood set, but there is the option of upgrading all the way to grade 11 if your budget allows.

Diamond-Like Carbon

Every metal part that you will handle on the FBX is Diamond-Like Carbon (DLC) coated, which is done on-site at the Blaser factory in Germany. This gives the metalwork corrosion-resistant protection and an incredibly hard surface that will enable a lifetime of wear and tear. A great video on YouTube from TGS Outdoors shows the manufacturing process, and it is very interesting and enjoyable to watch.

Barrels, rib, and chokes

The FBX incorporates a completely new barrel design, intended to deliver a smoother shot and more linear recoil. Each barrel features a forcing cone that is twice as long as those in the F3, improving shot ballistics and producing more consistent patterns. Shooters can choose between fixed ½ and ½ choked barrels or a multichoked version. The latter is supplied with a set of five extended Briley thin-wall chokes, ensuring a combination to suit most preferences.

My favourite attribute of this barrel is the 10-8mm tapered rib. It is incredibly pleasing to look over and makes it very easy to acquire and maintain focus on every target. The DLC coating is practical and looks great, plus the vented top rib above the vented mid rib looks very stylish.

The field test

I first used the prototype FBX a few months before the launch, and although I didn't put many shots through it, I instantly wanted to shoot it again. Fortunately, we received another FBX on the launch date, so I had the opportunity to get out to Barbury Shooting School with my good friend Mike to give the gun a real run for its money.

We both shot the FBX at virtually every target you would encounter over a round of sporting targets, and it performed incredibly well. From a 15 yard looper to a 40 yard crosser, the handling was perfect for what I want in a shotgun. It is perfectly balanced on the hinge pin and weighs 8lbs 9oz,











which is great for control on longer targets but also lively enough to push quickly on closer ones.

Our greatest finding from testing the gun was the lack of recoil. It was incredibly smooth to shoot, with virtually no muzzle flip from the 28g loads I was using. The transition from my first shot to acquiring the next target was effortless and extremely quick because of this. Another point to make is that Mike was using fibre wad cartridges, and they patterned fantastically, with clouds of black soot coming from most of the targets he hit. Be sure to check out the video we did on the Fieldsports with Speed YouTube channel to see just what I mean.

Verdict

The FBX is one of the best sporting shotguns I have ever had the pleasure of using, and I have genuinely considered whether I need to buy one. As much as I love the F3 model, I do believe that the stock dimensions, aesthetics, barrel technology, and design of the FBX have resulted in Blaser's ultimate creation.

The new stock configuration is very comparable to a Beretta DT11 Sporting, so if you are an admirer of the DT11's chunky-profiled stock, I believe you will like this gun. If you are a shooter who doesn't like a larger-profile stock and receiver, this may not be the gun for you.

Due to the smooth-shooting nature of the FBX, I believe it would be very well suited to anyone sensitive to recoil. During our initial testing with the prototype gun, we used some 36g game loads, and the recoil was still pleasant on the shoulder. This leads me to say that I know the FBX is aimed towards clay shooters, but I can see it being a popular choice for many game shooters due to its handling qualities, lack of recoil, and eye-pleasing tapered rib.

If I have one criticism, it is the removable trigger. A mechanical problem with this model is extremely unlikely, and giving the shooter access to try to fix a fault without the correct training or spare parts seems pointless.

Blaser UK has several FBX demonstrator guns across the country with its dealers, so be sure to get in contact to give one a go if this review has grabbed your attention.

I'm sure you won't be disappointed. GM
