MOMENTS IN MOTORSPORTS FIGURINES NOW AVAILABLE

MOMENTS in Motorsports is a joint venture between Automodello, noted distributors of top-end resincast model cars in 1/43, 1/24 and 1/12 scales, and History in Miniature, hand-sculpted historical figurines specialists. The first two in the range are a 1/18 sculpture of 'Super-Swede' Ronnie Peterson, and a 1/12 example of Jim Clark, both individually cast in pewter and hand-painted.

Ronnie Peterson Sweden's was twice runner-up in the F1 World Championship, in 1971 and in 1978, the year of his death. He was probably best-known for his association with Lotus, for whom he drove in 1973-74, and that fateful year of 1978. His figure is base-mounted in a standing position, with arms folded and without his helmet, Very well-detailed, the neckstrap of his driving suit is shown open and loose, the knitted cuffs and pocket trim are detailed, and all the logos front and back are well-replicated. The figure would look good posed against any suitable 1/18 F1 car. No 18LRP001 is priced at US\$99.99 and is limited to 150 pieces.

Jim Clark, one of the all-time greats of motor racing, was World Champion in 1963 and 1965, again for Lotus. He was tragically killed in an F2 race in Hockenheim, Germany, in April 1968. His figurine is in a seated pose, and is designed to go with, for example, the Automodello 1/12 Lotus 49 or AAR Eagle. It can 'sit' on the tyre or, for those without such a model, a section of pit wall is also available. Very well-detailed, he also is helmetless, with his goggles loose around his neck, and wearing driving gloves. All the logos on the overalls are well-reproduced. No 12LJC001 is priced at US\$129.99 and I is limited to 250 pieces. The wall section (12MPW001) is US\$19.99.

MINI GT GETS UP TO SPEED WITH CLASSIC F1 RACERS

JUST announced by MINI GT, on its social media pages, is this fabulous Lotus 78 Formula 1 racing car that will join its ranks of 1/64 scale replicas. The Lotus 78 will sit perfectly alongside the six-wheeled Tyrrell P34 that the company announced in December 2020 (although nothing further has been released about that model since). The photo shows the latest pre-production shot of the Lotus 78.

The JPS Lotus 78 made its debut in the 1977 Formula 1 season and also appeared during some 1978 races too. Driven by Mario Andretti, Gunnar Nilsson and Ronnie Peterson. The development chassis was then sold to Héctor Rebaque, who took part in several races as a privateer, so there will be plenty of livery options to choose from for further releases.

THE Saab 9-3 (pronounced "nine three" so as not to be confused with the late 1950s model 93, pronounced "ninety three") went through three generations and three different manufacturers during its lifetime (GM, Spyker and NEVS). Here, DNA has replicated the 2005 second generation version in cabriolet form, in three body colours - Lime Yellow Metallic,

Black and Chili Red Metallic.

The love affair between Saab and DNA has been here since the model company's very earliest days, and the feelings are clearly just as strong.

Focusing first on the car's exterior features, it comes with the powerful Aero kit, with front splitter, side skirts, rear diffuser, boot lip spoiler, five twin-spoke alloy rims with

the Saab logo integrated on the centre cap, and the single chromed exhaust pipe.

To the front, the engraved headlights and fog lights are packed with minute detail, as usual. Below the Saab logo applied on the bonnet, the finely-perforated front grille, through which you can see the radiator behind, and surrounded by aluminum trim, is perfectly replicated. You can even read the Saab inscription on the central aluminum part of the front grille.

Just below, the matt black protection trims are directing us harmoniously from the front bumper, passing by the sides, to finish its run to the rear bumper.

DNA hasn't missed anything in the rear of the car either - the "93" and "Aero" badges, the radio and GPS antennas on the boot, or the finely-replicated boot key lock - everything is there

A convertible version with a removable roof is fun, but only if the necessary level of detail inside the car is done very well - there is nowhere to hide in this respect. The Aero kit comes into play here too, as it means there should be specific features in the cockpit. The 6-speed gear lever (you can actually read the speeds on it!) is great, and the two-tone leather-effect

upholstery looks superb too, as does the metallic trim pack, especially on the steering wheel, centre console and door handles. All the tiny details are perfectly replicated - the integrated GPS, the multitude of buttons, the ignition key lock next to the gear lever, the famous turbo

gauge on the instrument cluster - everything is a real delight.

IXO'S DELIGHTFUL RALLYING BEETLE WINS OUR ADMIRATION AT THE 1973 RALLYE ELBA

ONE of five rallying Beetles so far released by Ixo from the 1973 season (three from Rally Portugal - RAC360A, B & C - and the sister car from this Elba event - #5, RAC324), this marvellous model fetures some lovely detailing and prefectly replicated markings. The sister #5 car might have won this event outright, but this model has really won our appreciation.

Ixo's Beetle casting is nothing new, of course, but this series of rallying VWs look particularly good in their simple silver with black bonnet. Those 'Austrian' go-faster stripes on the roof make all the difference, of

The 1973 Rally dell'Isola d'Elba, to give the event its full title. was the 6th running of

the event and the 5th rally of the year that counted towards the European Rally Championship. The entry list was impressive for the popular Rallye Elba this year, featuring cars that would leave any classic car enthusiast drooling today -Lancia Fulvia, Lancia Beta, Fiat 124 Abarth, Fiat 125, Fiat 128, Fiat X1/9, Simca Rallve, Volvo 142, Ford Escort Mexico, Opel Ascona, Simca Rallye, Renault 12, Citroën DS 19, Škoda 110 and, of course, VW Beetle - a quintet to be precise.

Driven by Luciano Trombotto with Giuseppe Zanchetti, this was the pairings first and, as it turned out, only outing in this car. Having campaigned since 1968 in a variety of Fiats (124s and an 850 Lombardi), Trombotto and Zanchetti drove together from the end of the 1972 season. After this solitary Beetle-based outing, the pair switched to an Opel Ascona for two further rounds in 1973, then an Alfa Romeo Alfetta for 1974.

Ixo's 1/43 scale replica is wonderfully executed. As mentioned earlier, the company's casting is tried and tested, but it certainly looks the part in this rallying guise, with the simple put purposefullooking black bonnet (a legacy from earlier times, supposed to reduce sun glare off the bonnet).

The detailing is lovely and the whole model just looks absolutely right. The neat auxiliary lamps round it off perfectly and the graphics are spot on. We love this!







A great replica - the lines of Ixo's Beetle are unmistakably good and the application of the paint and rally markings really add to the overall appeal.

NEW tooling from Corgi in the shape of the Bristol Beaufort MkI in 1/72 scale, commemorating the actions of Flying Officer Kenneth Campbell and his crew on Sunday 6th April 1941.

The protection of Britain's sea lanes during World War II was a crucial battle. Throughout the first few months of conflict, the German capital ship Gneisenau and her sister vessel Scharnhorst were posing a serious raiding threat and, on receiving news that the ships had entered Brest harbour to undergo repairs in late March 1941, the RAF immediately planned raids.

On Sunday 6th April 1941, Bristol Beaufort Mk.I N1016 (OA-X) took off from RAF St. Eval in Cornwall. The weather was poor and it was the only aircraft to make it to the rallying point. Descending to almost wavetop height. Pilot Flying Officer Kenneth Campbell, expertly lined up his Beaufort for the optimum attack angle, only releasing the single torpedo when he was sure it would strike the Gneisenau.

Having sustained heavy damage during its attack run, Bristol Beaufort N1016 crashed into the harbour almost immediately, tragically claiming Viewing this model from the rear is just as pleasing, with the camouflage perfectly applied.

the lives of all on board. The attack had successfully blown a huge hole under the waterline, causing Gneisenau to return to the dry dock from where it had only just emerged. It would be out of commission for almost six months and it is impossible to gauge how many lives were saved as a result of the heroic actions of this Beaufort crew.

For displaying valour in the face of extreme peril and without regard for his own safety, Flying Officer Kenneth Campbell was posthumously awarded the Victoria Cross, an honour he would surely have gladly shared with the rest of his crew.

Featuring detailed crew figures, parts for optional undercarriage positioning – either retracted or down – rotatable propeller, and torpedo load, it's another wonderful piece of tooling from Corgi. Limited to 1,900 pieces, this Beaufort is a wonderful replica that is a fitting tribute to the men lost on that heroic, but fateful mission.

TAKE a very close look. This is 1/64 scale! Yes, you read that correctly, all of these features are packed into an incredibly-detailed, small-scale replica of the mighty Lancia 037, wearing one of the most iconic motorsports liveries of all time.

Released under its premium HOBBY64+ brand, Tarmac Works has really put everything into this beauty. Packed with features and finished exquisitely throughout, this is the most impressive model I have ever seen at this scale.

The opening rear bodywork reveals an amazing level of detail at this size. There is even a scale-accurate, metal prop (supplied, but not shown here) to keep the section in an upright position. The model also comes with Marlboro decals to apply at home, to circumnavigate

the anti-tobacco sponsorship regulations.

With realistic tyres on detailed wheel rims, excellent paintwork and sublime Martini stripe graphics, all of the logos and markings are also present. The protective cage, specific to rallies like the Safari, and the roof-mounted spare wheel are all correctly replicated, as are the extra spotlights on the A-pillars.

Each model comes in a very impressive presentation case and outer box, with an individually-numbered certificate confirming its number in the limited production run. Interestingly, Tarmac Works hasn't specified the number this run is limited to, but this is #1948, so it's at least 2,000.

The price might seem a little high for a 1/64, but the quality of this is truly off the charts. These are selling like the proverbial just-out-of-theoven baked treats, so make like Markku Alén and be quick off the line to get the prize.

Revvin'n' ravin'

This month **Stephen Paul Hardy** blips the rev counter needle to the red line of extreme and back whilst examining a selection of Solido's recent 1/18 diecast releases.

s if by resolute response to my musings in "Pareto's Porsche" (May 2022 issue) first up this month are two releases that robustly tick all the boxes when it comes to the modelling of specific, real, cars. Following on from Solido's celebration of the contemporary tuning world, with the pair of LB Works makeovers of the Nissan R35 in Road & Track (February 2022 issue), we now have a pair of RWB makeovers based on Porsche 964s. Love them or hate them, there is no doubt that they are significant records of 21st century extreme styling.

RWB stands for RAUH-Welt Begriff (Rough World Concept) and is the signature of the high-profile Japanese car tuning company founded by Akira Nakai-San. A man that has turned his passion for air-cooled Porsches into a world-wide movement by redesigning them into drivable art. What may surprise you is that the second of the two RWB models has very strong British connections.

2011 RWB 964 "PANDORA ONE" (\$1807502)

Unboxing the "Pandora One" model (yes, pun intended!) underlines just how extreme the RWB widebody modifications to a 964 are. Nakai-San has been radically modifying Porsches for around 15 years now, with work that not only gives cars an aerodynamic advantage at track days, but a distinctive street image as well.

He achieves these creations with RWB kits that include front and rear bumpers, widened wheel arches, side skirts and a selection of accessory parts.

Rear spoilers are usually sourced from either the factory GT2 or a 3.8 RS. The work is carried out world-wide through certified partner workshops that market the RWB kits after the customers specific requirements have been established and the resulting GRP parts have been manufactured in Japan. Final assembly by Akira Nakai-San (who jets from country to country converting around 60 vehicles a year) is not for the faint hearted or purist. It involves sawing off the OE bumpers and fixing the bodykits to the remaining stub body sections with screws! The work normally takes Nakai-San 2-3 days and costs upwards of £30k. This is a model of the first RWB Porsche as delivered to an American owner.

2016 RWB 964 "HIBIKI" (\$1807501)

Arguably more attractive, this second RWB 964 in metallic orange illustrates how the RWB kits had developed in five years. It vibrantly replicates, in 1/18 scale, the first RWB Porsche built in England. So the pair of models, together, make an interesting display duo with the backstory of them having each been the first in their respective countries of ownership. What the models also share is the commendable attention paid by Solido, not only in modelling unique real vehicles, but to the degree of authentic detail inside and out at this price range.

1987 FORD SIERRA RS500 (S1806104)

Moving on, but staying very much with a British connection, this is surely a release that will delight





a lot of UK collectors, and one which I intuitively suspected would follow Solido's initial Ford Sierra Cosworth releases last year in "Road & Track" (February 2022 issue). Solido's modelling of the three-door RS500 Cosworth conversion by Tickford is fab news. For a start it is great to see a new model from this French manufacturer of a RHD car bearing UK style number plates. But in a more serious frame of mind, the subject itself is one that has become a well-recognised marker post in British automotive production history, and very worthy of more coverage. Setting aside the bodykit and rear spoiler additions, these 500 Tickford prepared cars were understated, in anticipation of motorsport customer adaptation. I found it interesting, therefore, just how charismatic this model is in its plain white paint. It leads the eye to appreciate the extent of detailing in the fully lensed light clusters, badging, trim and grey based upholstery of the interior, complete with the period door card and Recaro seat facings.

1967 RENAULT 8 1300 COUPE GORDINI (\$1803607)

The latest version in Solido's coverage of the Renault 8 production history is this Gordini version, typical of the cars that competed in the popular single brand Coupe de France Renault Gordini (then Coupe de France Renault) held on circuits across France

between 1966 and 2000. A nice, well-finished, lavishly-detailed model of a robust, long-running, French favourite.

1973 RENAULT 17 TS (S1803705)

Holding with the Gordini theme for a moment, Solido's colourful, evocative Renault 17 Gordini "Press On Regardless" model featured in "Arriving fast and furiously" (August 2021 issue) is, for me, now challenged by the latest Renault 17 offering. In so many ways it exudes early 1970s automotive vibes – styling, as well as colour and trim, fashions. So much so that, perhaps surprisingly, it stands out (by half a car's length) as my favourite of the six models with its well presented charisma of an era.

1978 RENAULT 4L GTL DDE ORANGE (S1800110)

In close second place, for me, though, is this the latest of something like eight different civilian and service variations on the Renault 4 theme. I have always thought the base model to be a fresh, very tidy and endearing take on the Renault 4 which looks, yet again, superb here in the livery of the "DDE" (Direction Départementale de l'Equipement) service dedicated to road maintenance in France. After all, with so much tarmac-tearing potential in the other five models, this functionally colourful one really deserved the final word.

Ocean racin'

Stephen Paul Hardy gets his hands on the tiller of DNA Collectibles' latest release depicting another of Volvo's 'Ocean Race' special editions.

he backstory to 'Ocean Race' is that it is sailing's toughest around-the-world yacht race. Held every three years, with each edition of the race lasting for up to nine months, it was known previously as the "Volvo Ocean Race". Then, in 2018, after twenty years of joint ownership Volvo Group and Volvo Car Group decided that it was time to relinquish control. Since 2018, though, Volvo has continued to be involved as a sponsor, with the 2022-23 edition starting from Alicante, Spain, on 15 January 2023. Volvo's 'Ocean Race' models celebrate the company's involvement in the event, with a very sound reason for marketing special edition versions of contemporary production models equipped with unique specification packages.

In addition to being a superb display companion for its previously-released V90 Cross Country 'Ocean Race', DNA's new XC70 'Ocean Race' makes a great contribution to the company's growing back catalogue of the Volvo 70 series, including the two generations of V70 R, on which the XC70 is based.

2006 VOLVO XC70 'OCEAN RACE' (DNA000070)

Sharing a common chassis with the V70 R, the Cross Country adaptations to make the XC70 include All Wheel Drive and raised suspension, supplemented by practical protective trims to the wheel arches, unpainted bumpers and aluminium pack parts. The special edition upgrades included Ocean Blue paintwork and official logo badging externally, whilst the interior, offered in black or beige, was enhanced by bright blue aluminium trims to the door panels and centre console.

Starting with that interior then, and with a detail often over-looked, the model features a full headlining and sun visor set that flows seamlessly down the A, B, C and D pillars to meet the door

and tailgate cappings, and lower interior trim. DNA Collectibles has gone with the light beige rather than black interior option, making it much more visually accessible.

The special blue aluminium trim additions to the already highly-detailed cabin equipment fittings are all readily visible.

Externally, yet again, it is difficult not to be repetitious with superlatives

about the quality of finish and attention to detail achieved by DNA in its 1/18 resincast models. The immaculate dark blue metallic paintwork is complemented by the black and aluminium Cross Country trim pieces. As always, the degree of fine detailing to the light lenses, including the spoiler mounted high level brake light, is admirable. The same can be said about the badging and other small details that add the finishing touches.

Corgi has announced its new model releases for the next few months. There's new tooling, a return to an old favourite, and plenty more.

ollowing on from its January range launch, Corgi has confirmed an even wider range of products as the year continues, including the introduction of an entirely new range of 1/76 scale products, designed for collectors and model railway enthusiasts alike under the revitalised Trackside brand, exclusive to **corgi.co.uk**, of course. Some of these were announced earlier this year, but arrival slots have now been updated due to the current global delivery delays.



Pre-war Le 5000 Mans winners

As we approach the race's centenary, in 2023, **Ian Artus** takes us back to before World War II, to take a look at all the winners in those early years.

or any motorsport enthusiast, the endurance race held on the Circuit de la Sarthe, at Le Mans, must rank at the very top of the classic motor races, along with the Monaco GP and the Indianapolis 500, where the circuit in use today can be traced back directly to that used in the early years of the event. The idea of 24-hour races was not entirely new when Charles Faroux and George Durand conceived the event for standard production touring cars. The organising club, known as the Automobile Club de l'Ouest, the ACO, had already been involved in early races close to its headquarters in the town of Le Mans, including speed trials in the late 19th century and the Auto Club de France, ACF, French GP of 1906. Concurrently, Emile Coquille, importer of the Rudge wheel into France, had offered a large prize for a new kind of race. Thus the first 24 Hours Grand Prix d'Endurance race was run in May 1923, as the first round of three races for the Rudge Whitworth Triennial Cup. Later this was to become biennial and, in 1928, official race winners were also recognised. The races were run to a very comprehensive set of rules, which changed each year and cannot be covered in any detail in a short article. Ixo Models has served collectors very well,

modelling at least one model from every year of competition, from the first 1923 race, allowing for an interesting collection to be built up. The models, made in China, are metal diecast with plastic details and finished to a good standard, set on a plinth with a clear cover protected by a cardboard sleeve cut away with a representation of the circuit, albeit the modern format. A backing card pictures the circuit's famous Dunlop bridge.

EARLY RACES

The early races were run over a 10.72 miles course using the normal roads of the era. In 1929, the course was made shorter, bypassing a hairpin bend in the town suburbs and, in 1932, shortened again to 8½ miles to give what is roughly the circuit still in use today. The original circuit incorporated RN138, the Le Mans-Tours Road providing the Mulsanne Straight, where the cars could reach flat-out speeds.

To meet modern safety requirements, the circuit now has the tarmac road surface, safety barriers, upto-date pits and signalling systems – none of which were around in 1923, when the cars set off 26th May in descending order of engine capacity. A total of 33 cars, all from French manufacturers, except two Belgian 5.3-litre Excelsiors and one British 3-litre

Bentley, to qualify for the Triennial Cup. The 1923 race started in a hailstorm and then a thunderstorm. From this first race until 1927, the official results just recognised distance covered in the 24 hours. Only three cars failed to finish and all the finishers qualified for the next round of the Triennial Cup.

Chenard et Walcker was a French manufacturer of cars and commercial vehicles from 1898. It made taxis for Paris and Hispano-Suiza aero engines during World War I. The Le Mans tourer had a 3-litre OHC engine, with four passenger seats. All the larger capacity cars (over 1,100cc) had to have four seats and carry three weights of 60kg to represent the passengers. The regulations required entries to be standard touring cars with mudguards, running boards, hood, horns, mirror and lights, of which 30 had to have been made.

LM1923 CHENARD ET WALCKER

At the end of 24 hours, a 3-litre Chenard et Walcker had achieved the greatest distance -1,373miles at just over 57mph. The regulations required the cars to be in the colours of the entering country. The French Blue model has full length running boards and wings, with a spare wheel on the driver's side (RHD) and a large horn on the passenger side. There are large front headlamps plus the driver has a large lamp mounted alongside. The four-seater body has a small rear boat tail with a large fuel tank between the rear dumb-irons. The body has no hood or tonneau cover and there is a full-length undertray. A sister car was second and, classed fifth, was the sole 3-litre Bentley. However, demonstrating the shape of things to come, the Bentley achieved the fastest lap at 66.69mph.

After a distinguished wartime service developing aero engines, W O Bentley set up his eponymous company with his brother in 1919. From the start, the cars were tested in motorsport events, including Brooklands and Indianapolis. The 1923 Le Mans entry was by a Bentley dealer, John Duff, however the showing that year was good enough for Bentley to have a works' entry the following year.

LM1924 3-LITRE BENTLEY

The 1924 race was run in June, for better weather and longer evenings, with an entry of all French manufacturers except the lone 3-litre Bentley. At the finish, the British Racing Green Bentley was in the lead, followed by two Lorraine-Dietrichs. As modelled by Ixo, the Bentley has its hood up — the regulations for this year required two laps with the hood up during the first five laps. The head lamps have covers and the radiator an extra grille, after the damage caused to lamps, radiators and fuel tanks from loose stones thrown up from the rough roads during the first race. The Bentley badge of a red "B" flanked by wings, show this is a "Red Label" sports model, with the tuned engine and shorter chassis.

Lorraine-Dietrich was a French manufacturer dating back to 1896, moving from locomotives to automobiles. Active in early motor sport, it competed without success in the first two 24 Hours and then won the next two with its B3-6

model, with a six-cylinder 3,445cc ohv engine in a chassis sporting power-assisted brakes. Entries continued in later years with limited success.

LM1925 LORRAINE-DIETRICH B3-6 & LM1926 LORRAINE-DIETRICH B3-6

In 1925, and in subsequent years, the race was again run in June. There was a strong international entry for 1925 from USA, Britain and Italy. This race was the first to use the 'Le Mans start', with the cars parked diagonally across the road from the drivers who, when the flag dropped, had to run to their cars and erect the hood before starting the engine and departing. Three Bentleys started, two suffered mechanical failure and the other ran out of brakes. A British Sunbeam followed the winning Lorraine-Dietrich home. The following year, 1926 saw three teams battle for the honours – Lorraine-Dietrich, Peugeot and Bentley. The Peugeots and Bentleys faded and Lorraine-Dietrich finished 1, 2 and 3.

Ixo has modelled both years with the cars in the correct French Blue. The 1925 cars carried two spare wheels and a tonneau cover over the rear seats. The 1926 car does not carry spare wheels, as confirmed by contemporary pictures. The modelled miniatures carry a lot of pleasing detail, such as the fasteners for the tonneau covers picked out in silver, detailed dashboards, horns and lamps.

THE BENTLEY YEARS - LM1927 BENTLEY 3-LITRE, LM1928 BENTLEY 4½-LITRE, LM1929 BENTLEY 'SPEED 6' 6.6-LITRE, LM1930 BENTLEY 'SPEED 6' 6.6-LITRE

The 1927 race is noted for the crash at Maison Blanche (White House) corner, when a crash in the dark, and the ensuing melée, took out the leading 4½-litre Bentley and two of the 3-litre Bentleys,

- 6 The Bentley Speed Six is the ultimate racing Bentley, and the model shows the classic lines of this lovely car. Bentley added two cylinders to the four cylinder 4.5-litre to produce some 200hp in Le Mans trim.

- 11 The Alfa Romeo 8C was the first supercharged car to win at Le Mans, and Alfa Romeo was the first Italian manufacturer to win, albeit with British drivers Tim Birkin had been one of the Bentley boys.

plus others. SCH 'Sammy' Davis found that his 3-litre Bentley could be driven and the rest is Bentley history, the car winning ahead of a 1.1-litre Salmson. The winning Bentley, known as "Old No. 7", was the one that crashed in 1926 when its brakes failed when running 3rd near the end.

The 1928 race saw American manufacturers take over from the French as challengers, with Stutz and Chrysler joining Ariès against a trio of Bentley 4½-litre cars in the large engine category. The Bentleys finished first and fifth, with the winning car followed closely by the Stutz and the two Chryslers.

The 1929 race was fought out on the revised circuit, which by-passed the Pontlieue hairpin, between British and American teams – Bentley versus Stutz and Chrysler. Bentley fielded one new Speed 6 plus the previous 4½-litre cars. The result was a Bentley triumph, 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th, followed again by Stutz and Chrysler.

The last of the Bentley years was 1930, with the 6.6-litre Speed Sixes finishing 1st and 2nd. The Bentley company was on the verge of financial collapse, despite the racing successes. The Rolls-Royce Company that took over Bentley had no interest in motor racing, so a glorious four years that cemented Le Mans 24 Hours in the minds of British enthusiasts, along with the "Bentley Boys" legend, was over. Private owners continued to race the cars with little success.

The five Ixo models of the racing Bentleys are all in correct British Racing Green and show an excellent degree of detailing, with bonnet straps, tonneau covers over the rear seats, detailed dashboards and steering wheels, with wooden rims, with additional headlights on some models. In 1928, running with raised hoods was no longer required, and in later years many cars ran with folded down main windscreens with the driver sat behind an aero screen. The models carry the correct racing numbers.

This Italian Company can be traced back to 1906, to a factory built in Italy to manufacture Darracq cars. In 1909, a new company arose, Anonima Lombarda Fabbrica Automobili (Lombardy Car Manufacturing Company). Cav. G Merosi designed a new range of cars that did well in competition. During World War I, the firm was taken over by Nicola Romeo, who owned a company making mining machinery, to create Alfa Romeo.

The new company continued the A.L.F.A. tradition of motor sport becoming very successful. A private 1750 6C had run at Le Mans for the first time in 1930, but the company made a significant effort, with 8C 2.3-litre cars winning over the next four years. These were the first supercharged cars to win at Le Mans. Alfa Romeo racing, at this time, was managed by Scuderia Ferrari, based in Modena, managed by a certain Enzo Ferrari.

In 1931, only six cars survived tyre failures, mechanical failures and accidents to finish, but it was an Alfa Romeo 8C that won, ahead of the second-placed Mercedes Benz 7.1-litre SSK. Bugatti was one of the teams to experience tyre problems, as did the powerful and fast Mercedes.

The race in 1932 saw the 8C finish 1st and 2nd on the revised 8½-mile circuit, using a new by-pass to Tertre Rouge, taking the circuit well away from the suburbs of Le Mans. 1933 saw a 1-2-3 triumph for the 8C. The winning drivers were Raymond Sommer and the great Tazio Nuvolari, winning his only Le Mans. 1934 saw the last win for Alfa Romeo, with a single French-entered car finishing, driven by Chinetti and Etancelin. Chinetti was later to drive the winning Ferrari in 1949. A 2nd place in 1935 saw the final race for Alfa-Romeo 8C at Le Mans. A very creditable run.

for Italian team entries, but blue for 1934, which was a French-entered car. As with all of this series, the replication is very pleasing, including cockpit detailing, tonneau covers, and folded down windscreen with an aero screen for the driver. The radiators carry the famous Alfa Romeo badge of the red cross of Milan and the Visconti family snake. The '32 to '34 cars had semi-streamlined mudguards, although how effective the streamlining was is doubtful.

LM1935 LAGONDA RAPIDE

Lagonda was a British company, despite its continental-sounding name, dating back to 1906 – founded by an American born, British national, Wilbur Gunn. The name originated after the Shawnee settlement in Springfield, Ohio. Gunn died in 1920 and three existing directors took over the company. Various models were produced in the 1920s and '30s but relevant to this article was the M45R Rapide, with a six-cylinder OHV, 4½-litre Meadows engine in a shortened chassis.

British entries dominated the 1935 race, but among the larger-engined cars were two Lagondas, a Duesenberg, a Lorraine -Dietrich (for the last time), a Delahaye and three Bugattis, plus four Alfa-Romeo 8C models. Surely it would be another Alfa win? In the event, three Alfas fell away with various ailments. The winning Lagonda proved very reliable and the Alfa that finished second had received misinformation on race position and the driver found out too late to catch the Lagonda.

The Ixo model of the red Lagonda does not disappoint. I cannot find a reference to explain why the two Lagondas raced in Italian red and not British Racing Green. The model shows a conventional sports car of its era, not unlike the earlier Bentleys, and many of the French sports cars, with cycle-type mudguards. The radiator sports the Lagonda badge.

LM1937 BUGATTI TYPE 57S 3.3-LITRE

No race was held at Le Mans in 1936 due to labour unrest. The resulting general strike in France led to a shortage of labour able to work at the race.

Ettore Bugatti was a scion of the artistic Italian Bugatti family, who founded his eponymous car company in 1909 at Molsheim in the Alsace Region, at the time part of Germany, but which reverted to France in the settlement after the Great War. His cars were involved in motorsports in the pre-World War I years.

Bugattis competed at Le Mans in the early years without much success, although the famous French cars achieved great success in many other motorsport events around Europe. The years 1937 and 1939 proved more fortunate for the Bugatti marque at Le Mans.

The 1937 race saw a bad crash that sadly caused the death of two drivers. The Bugatti won with a commanding lead – the first French car to win since 1926. By 1937, the original 'standard touring car' idea was fading away and cars were just required to have a minimum of two comfortable seats facing forward in the front, that is, not single seat racing cars.

The Ixo Bugatti 57S model represents the very streamlined shape of cars of the late thirties, referred to at the time as 'tanks', without separate mudguards/wings and with faired-in headlamps (a nod to the 1923 Tipo 32). Ixo has represented the unique radial spoked wheels developed by Bugatti very well. A spare wheel was semi-recessed in the tail and there is a clear Bugatti badge on the nose of the car.

LM1938 DELAHAYE 3.6-LITRE

Delahaye had a pedigree stretching back to 1894, founded by Emile Delahaye. A racing department was created in 1932 and cars competed at Le Mans

from 1935 to 1939.

The 1938 entry list was very much dominated by French entries, with no less than seven Delahaye cars, including two 4.5-litre V12 models, and various Talbot models, opposed by two Alfa Romeos, including an Alfa Corse 2.9-litre Type C Coupe.

The 24-hour race started like a Grand Prix, but in the event all the faster cars, including the Alfa Coupe, expired and the rugged Delahayes finished 1-2. The blue Delahaye looks rather old fashioned, compared to the sleek Bugatti cars of 1937 and '39, with its separate cycle wings, headlamps on brackets and a bonnet strap.

LM1939 BUGATTI TYPE 57C 3.3-LITRE

The last race at Le Mans before World War II saw another win for Bugatti against strong opposition. The winner covered 2,084 miles, at an average of nearly 87 mph – 30mph faster than the first winner in 1923, albeit on a circuit with a better road surface. The Bugatti was followed by a Delage and two Lagondas. Jean Bugatti thought that the 200hp car should be able to reach nearly 170mph.

The Ixo model matches contemporary photos very well, including the Bugatti radial spoke wheels and the third central headlamp. This is the final model in an altogether very pleasing set of 16 models of an historic race.

Overall, there were six wins for French cars, with four manufacturers, six for Britain with two, and four for Italy with one. Of the seven wining manufacturers it could be argued that only Alfa Romeo has carried its racing pedigree through to the present time.

No further races were held at Le Mans until well after the end of World War II, when a new star appeared in the form of Ferrari 2-litre V12, winner in 1949, but that is another story... DC



The X-files from Weissach

Inspired by a book from 1984 about lesser-known Porsche specials, **Francisco Mota** builds a 1/43 scale collection with some of the most obscure cars from Weissach, Porsche's 'think tank' for many years.

he search for the book inevitably
eventually took me in the direction of
that familiar, multicolour online auction
website. After not too much time, there it
was – a well-thumbed copy of "Porsche
Specials" by Lothar Boschen and Jürgen Barth. This
was the 1986 English edition of the German language
original from two years earlier. A hard cover, smallsized volume with 224 pages printed on average
quality paper, with only monochrome images and not
a hint of Photoshop work.

The author writes in the introduction that he went after unknown cars made by Porsche, both as prototypes or studies, plus a few other cars created by external people, the ones he calls the "private"

In 1984, Boschen admitted that "Porsche is bound to secrecy in respect of outside contracts" and that "some clients are not prepared to release information" even decades after the cooperation took place. He did his best to find the most interesting and lesser-known projects, but omitted what he called "secret activities" and finished by saying that "Some may still surface in the future." And so they did.

As fascinating as the book was to read, for a diecast model collector this would never be the end of the story. So, a new collecting theme was born and the hunt for 1/43 scale replicas of the cars featured in the book began. To be honest, this is much easier now than it would have been in the eighties. Forty years

later, some model makers are desperate to find cars that nobody has reproduced before, so delving into the Porsche specials seems a good option for some of them, like AutoCult, Kess, BoS and Matrix. After all, the brand is as famous as ever and the interest in all things Porsche leads collectors to look for unusual subjects. The author was right – many 'new' special cars with the Porsche badge have come out into the open during the last four decades, many more than are featured in the book!

BACK IN THE FIFTIES

One of the most interesting subjects is not even a car, but a mock-up made in 1957, apparently to decide what a new Porsche might look like. It received the internal code number 695 and was reproduced as a resincast by AutoCult. The real size clay model was commissioned to freelance car stylist Albrecht Graf Goertz, of BMW 507 fame. Porsche wanted to see how he would imagine the future 901. Maybe this styling exercise had some influence in the 911 final shape, but was not followed by Porsche – it was considered "too American".

The 1/43 replica successfully tries to simulate the

clay's colour and matt finish, featuring asymmetrical design, from one side to the other. This was a practical way to show Porsche's board two different styling options. There's not much detail that could have been reproduced as a scale model, however it fits any collection dedicated to the 911.

The second lesser-known Porsche is the 1955 Teram Puntero. This was an Argentinian initiative, by local company Teram. It convinced Porsche to supply the 356 flat-four engine and other mechanical parts so that the car could be built locally.

Only 144 cars were made but the shape still looks elegant today, even if some may say it looks similar to the VW Karmann-Ghia coupe, released at the same time. AutoCult reproduced this one as a high quality resincast, with Porsche headlights and several chromed parts, like bumpers and hubcaps. The cabin looks as nice as the real car's, with steel dash painted body colour.

In the fifties, there were many 'specials' made for racing and using parts from several carmakers. This was the case in Germany with Porsche and VW. Walter Glöcker was a VW dealer in Frankfurt and had been racing with all sorts of specials until he decided

to build his own, in association with Porsche. He created a few open top racers that inspired Porsche to build its own special, the 550 Spyder.

In 1954, the Porsche Glöcker coupe was launched. It was the sixth car from this cooperation and was designed for the 1954 Mille Miglia, but debuted in competition at that year's Liège–Rome–Liège road rally. Best Of Show (BoS) made an extraordinary job of modelling this small racing car, fitted with the 356 Carrera 1500 engine.

The door windows go as far as the roof, the rear window is a wraparound affair and there are a pair of grilles on top of the engine cover. The shape of the rear lamps is unique and there are the traditional double exhaust pipes.

Next to this, we photographed the 1959 Porsche 550 Durelite Spyder. This was the result of a DIY job after the owner of a Porsche 550 Spyder RS crashed it while racing. He and his friends built a tubular frame and installed the Porsche engine in it, giving the body it's own shape.

The car was successful and much cheaper than a new one. AutoCult reproduced this one-off with extreme care. The front looks much closer to the ground than any official Porsche at the time, and the rear shape is vertical. Interestingly, there are three mirrors around the driver's seat.

More conventionally styled is the 356B 1600 Reutter Ghia-Aigle, a big name for a small car made in 1961 by the Swiss branch of Italian coachbuilder Ghia. This was a 356B conversion with emphasis on aerodynamics, ordered by a Swiss car enthusiast. It features the same mechanics, and most of the cabin, of the 356B, with a completely different aluminium body. This one was modelled by Matrix as a high-end scale model and features an excellent paint job. The rear is much lower than a regular 356B and there are no bumpers. Headlamps have Plexiglas covers.

TEST DRIVING THE 901

Next is a 911 test-mule, complete with front and rear clams to disguise the real shape of the car underneath. It's painted matt military green and was road tested in 1962. AutoCult names it the 901/02 Fledermaus and the replica is top notch. Side rear windows are not yet the definitive items and the rear window is a two-piece affair. This prototype was also known as "The Bat" due to its tail fins.

The next three models are derivatives of the same base car - the mid-engine 914/6 - and were all unveiled in 1970. The more conventional looking two-door coupe is the Frua Hispano-Aleman Vizcaya. This was a one-off commissioned by Spanish car importer Bernard Heiderich to Pietro Frua, the Italian coachbuilder. AutoCult made another great job with it. The car looks much more upmarket than the basic 914/6 with flying buttresses behind the cockpit and pop-up headlamps, all perfectly reproduced. The green 914/6 is known as the Graf Goertz, as it was designed by the same Albrecht Graf von Goertz, mentioned above. Seen from the side, it looks a lot like a miniature shooting brake, however, it keeps the mid-engine and the mechanicals are unchanged. Front end is even lower than Porsche's donor car, featuring a pair of extra spotlights and keeping the traditional Fuchs wheels. There's a moveable spoiler on the roof's trailing edge. All this was perfectly modelled by AutoCult, and it did not miss the slightly ungainly narrow tracks of the real car. The third 914/6 variation was also modelled by Autocult and features the Tapiro, a one-off designed by Giugiaro for Porsche. It was initially a concept car, with gullwing doors, unveiled at the Turin Motorshow. Subsequently it was sold to a private owner who used it as a street car. The scale model has all the features in the right places, like the large glass area, red seats and vertical rear section.

We move on to another trio of derivatives, in this case based on the 901 and 911. The first one is the 1964 911 HLS Concept and looks nothing like a 911. The wedge shape, flat and low front end with four headlamps are closer to an Italian supercar. The sides are also totally different and the rear features superposed black blades in place of a rear window. All of this was detailed by AutoCult, plus the conventional Porsche steel wheels without hubcaps. The old-style wing mirror is the only thing that takes the car back to 1964. The most original feature of this car is not shown on the scale model – the doors, roof and windscreen were a single piece that tilted forward to give access to the cabin.

The second 911 derivative looks not very special at all, but it is. The 1964 901 Cabrio Karmann was the first open-topped version, however it was never built like that on the early 911s, a Targa top was made instead. Again, AutoCult modelled this one, without any canvas top, not even folded. Obviously, the 901 shape looks great, as does the interior, with tartan seats and wooden dash. The third variation is the 1969 dayglow green 911 B17 Pininfarina. Here, the plan was to explore ways to give the 911 more room for rear seat passengers, while keeping as much of the exterior shape as possible. The car had an extra 192 mm wheelbase, but the result was not good enough in terms of styling, weight and turning circle, so it did not go further. Matrix made the early 2.2-litre 911S 1969 version and this 2.7-liter Carrera, updated in 1975. It also had wider rear wheels and front spoiler that can be found on the scale model.

The next pair are 911 prototypes, both studies on how to make a faster version. The silver car with blacked out headlamps is a 1984 911 Carrera 3.2 E19, modelled by Kess. This was a prototype based on the 934 generation and focused on improving

the aerodynamics for the next 964 generation. Some solutions, like the flatter nose were used later, others, like the big wing not so. Kess reproduced the car as it was displayed at Porsche Museum a few years ago, complete with flat hubcaps and nice painting. The matt black car next to this one is the 1988 965 V8, a test mule fitted with a V8 Audi engine at the rear. It looks like the 959 supercar, but was a different project, designed to be positioned under the 959 as a top of the range 964-generation 911. The project got too expensive and Porsche's board abandoned it, in favour of a 964 flat-six turbo. Another one for AutoCult, a manufacturer that always excels in obscure subjects like this.

THE 'SECRET' WAREHOUSE

The model maker had access to the warehouse near Porsche's headquarters, where the sole prototype that survived is kept. Of course, it's not a surprise to learn that it made a great-looking replica, with all the necessary information. It's interesting to see how close the body looks to the 959, however the scale model is taller and narrower. There are nice touches, like the headlamps that look taken from a 928, or the shape and size of the rear wing. There are even very small blue decals in special parts of the body that surely had some kind of usefulness to the engineers.

The last pair of unknown Porsches are two projects that could have made it into production. In fact, they came close to reaching the dealerships until Porsche's board decided otherwise at the last moment. You don't need to know all the details to see that, just looking at the way both cars are finished. The same can be said about the 1/43 replicas, once again released by AutoCult.

The first one is the 984 Junior Prototype, a study made in 1987 that had the mission to investigate how the brand could design and build a new small and accessible sports car. In fact, it all started as the Seat PS, designed by Porsche for the Spanish brand, using the same inline four-cylinder engines that Porsche had designed for the Ibiza – the famous System Porsche units. But the Seat PS was considered too expensive for such a brand in the early eighties and the project was cancelled at an early stage. Porsche didn't abandoned the idea of a small, light and affordable sports car for its own range and the 984 Junior was born in 1984.

The plan was to use as many parts from other cars in the company as possible, to keep costs down. Even if the car looks like it is front-engined with rear wheel drive, in fact the flat-four was behind the rear driven wheel. There was a retractable roof, so it could be easily transformed from a coupe to a cabriolet at the touch of a button. The concept evolved until 1987, when Porsche came to the conclusion that it wasn't possible to achieve the lower price tag it wanted, and the 984 was shelfed. This is another prototype that rests in the famous Porsche warehouse, so AutoCult seized the opportunity and released another pearl. The scale model surprises because it is much smaller than a 924. Proportions are spot-on, finish is top notch and there are plenty of details to enjoy.

The other prototype that almost made it was the four-door 989. This was made in 1988, at a time when Porsche was looking into the possibility of build a big luxury saloon, an ancestor to the Panamera. The 989 followed the 911 lines, trying

to adapt the same silhouette to a four-door car. Maybe the result was not the best, in aesthetic terms, however the car was almost ready to enter production in 1991, when Porsche decided the timing was not right. The scale model is from AutoCult and shows how long the wheelbase was, to accommodate a second row of seats. The wheels seem too small, by today's standards, but the front bonnet disguises very well the fact that it hides a front-mounted V8 engine. It is a very clean shape, so there are not many details on the model.

The last of the Porsche Specials is a matt black 1985 Porsche Experimental Prototype (PEP). This time, the aim was not to anticipate any particular model, but to look into the future and see what could be done better. It was made in modular form and was tested with different engines and engine location. The aim was to test driving dynamics, but there was also some interest in looking at possibilities to build an entry level Porsche. The car still survives and AutoCult released a 1/43 scale model, with the same slightly awkward proportions, flat nose and high rear wing. A true test-mule in which we can see there was not much time spent on the styling. In a way, the PEP encapsulates the spirit of this collection. The good thing is that there are a few more unique cars in that famous warehouse near Weissach. DC

The Americans are here

There has been a huge surge in the popularity of 1/64 scale in recent years. Rick Wilson has been truly swept along by the wave of new manufacturers and highly-detailed miniatures.



ou may have noticed a certain scale featuring more and more prominently over the last few years. It's not a new one, as Brian Salter covered so well in his recently-finished Size Matters series, and has been a very popular scale for decades over in the USA, with the likes of GreenLight, Johnny Lightning and Auto World leading the way. And that's exactly where we've headed to for this second instalment.

Our spotlight scale of 1/64 has been huge on the other side of the Atlantic for several decades, and its popularity continues undiminished. Certain companies have a substantial market share between them, but there is still plenty of room for many excellent, smaller manufacturers. Brian Salter covered the origins of this scale in the October 2020 issue, so I won't duplicate his words here, instead I'm choosing to concentrate on modern developments. This won't be an exhaustive article, as that would take up too much room — I'll just give you an overview of the choice out there.

AUTO WORLD

Auto World is a brand of diecast models and slot cars, primarily focused on American-made cars. The brand was originally founded by Sports Car Club of

America Hall of Famer, Oscar Koveleski, in 1958. Today, Auto World has diecast line-ups for 1/18 and 1/64 scales. Auto World's smaller-scale cars are heavy on the detail and accurately made in 1/64 scale – something that the company is keen to point out on its packaging.

Frequently, its replicas will have opening features, even at this scale. It certainly adds to the brand's appeal and we have an example of a C8 Corvette, complete with opening rear deck.

These days, Auto World is owned by Round 2-a company that also happens to manufacture another well-known US brand of 1/64 diecast. But more about that shortly.

M2 MACHINES

Parent company, Castline, was founded by Chris Leong in 2007. The company is currently based in Azusa, California. M2 Machines is the brand name for its line up of 1/64 and 1/24 scale diecast models of cars and trucks from the 1930s up to the 1980s. As with most diecast companies, production is based in Asia. Vice President of Product Development at M2 Machines, Sean Taylor, has designed almost all of the M2 Machines diecast models, incorporating some seriously exciting details and opening parts into these very-affordable miniatures.

It's a range that is already making inroads into my collection at this scale, with a pair of 1940s customs and a delightful 1965 Ford Econoline in there. The latter comes complete with two alternative sets of interchangeable wheels and tyres, plus a four-post lift - an absolutely wonderful set.

JOHNNY LIGHTNING

The brand was launched in 1969, by Topper Corporation (owner of Topper Toys), and was similar to Mattel's hugely successful Hot Wheels cars. The company's claim to fame at that time was that its products were extremely fast compared to other brands of diecast cars. Topper closed in 1973 and production of Johnny Lightning cars ceased for 23 years. The company made a total of 47 different models.

In 1994, Thomas Lowe of Michigan became aware of the abandoned trademark and secured the rights to the Johnny Lightning name for his Playing Mantis toy company. He made replicas of his favourite 10 original Johnny Lightning cars and the company's first customers were Walmart and Toys "R" Us. Playing Mantis produced cars under the Johnny Lightning brand name from 1994 to June 2004. Over 600 different models were produced during that time period.

In 2004, Lowe sold Playing Mantis (including the Johnny Lightning brand) to RC2 Corporation, which in turn was bought by the Japanese toy company, Tomy, in 2011. Tomy discontinued the Johnny Lightning line of diecast cars in 2013, but the brand continued to maintain a following by a loyal group of collectors. In early 2016, Round 2, a toy company owned by Thomas Lowe (who also still owned Playing Mantis), revived and reintroduced Johnny Lightning vehicles to the toy market for a second time.

The range has been a huge success this time around, with many TV and film licences helping to boost the appeal of its product line. Examples of these shown here include James Bond's 'shot up' DB5 from No Time to Die (a current release), the Plymouth Fury that played a starring role in Christine, and a couple of interesting ideas – a model that comes with its own tiny Monopoly playing piece, which can be used in the game, and a heavily customised Chevrolet Camaro as the first release in its Zingers range.

Focusing on that most famous (notorious?) of Plymouth Furys, Christine, there have been several releases over the years, depicting certain phases of

the movie – night mode Christine, with blacked out windows, unrestored condition Christine, as bought, complete with figurines and restored Christine, complete with a resincast section of Darnell's Garage, where the work was 'carried out'.

GREENLIGHT COLLECTIBLES

GreenLight is based in Indianapolis, USA, and produces diecast model vehicles in a variety of scales. Its 1/64 range is the most successful and is constantly being updated, with new tooling and releases still flowing well, despite recent global problems. The company was founded, in 2002, by Kevin Davey, originating from sporting goods companies Davey Sports Management and Radius Group. The company initially sold sports-related goods and IndyCar replicas. Soon after, it concentrated more and more on diecasts.

It was acquired by Russell Hughes, Tom van der Scheun and Fred Lo in 2013. Hughes focused on obtaining licences from movies and TV shows to produce vehicles associated with them, building on the brand's success selling replicas of the Ford Mustang featured in the film *Bullitt*. The company has grown substantially under its new owners.

GreenLight's products focus on detailed diecast models that are meant for collecting. Among the top-selling models are replicas of vehicles featured in movies and TV shows, including the *Fast and Furious* series. These come under GreenLight's 'Hollywood' range banner. It also holds licensing

agreements with many of the world's major vehicle manufacturers, meaning the production opportunities are vast. There are a few examples of these releases shown here – from the TV shows *The A Team, Starsky & Hutch*, and *Fargo*. From the movies, on show are releases from *Vanishing Point, Thelma & Louise*, and *Christine*. And there's that Plymouth Fury again...

Interestingly, both of the Johnny Lightning and GreenLight versions of Christine claim to be 1/64 scale, but they are clearly slightly different in terms of size. After a quick search online for the dimensions of the real car, I broke out my dear old calculator and worked out that the GreenLight is bang on, but the Johnny Lightning casting is actually closer to 1/72 scale. Take a look at the comparison photo to the left – it's quite a difference.

GreenLight also has many innovative lines to group vehicles into and maximise its licences, widening the collecting appeal, whilst also cleverly introducing the collector into areas that might not be on their 'radar', such as the huge variety of Airstream trailers that have appeared, both individually and as part of its 'Hitch & Tow' and 'Hitched Homes' series. Vintage Ad Cars is another interesting series, where old period adverts are used as reference to reproduce models of the cars in the adverts – a small facsimile of the original advertisement is included in the packaging artwork.

Other current ranges include 'The Busted Knuckle Garage', 'The Blue Collar Collection', 'Club Vee-Dub', and 'Running on Empty'. Accessories are also available, including alternative wheel and tyre sets, four-post lifts and display units.

Two of my favourites, by GreenLight, are the 1986 Fleetwood Bounder RV that featured in *Breaking Bad*,

and a 'First Cut' version in bare metal. First Cut is an occasional range that gives the company extra mileage out of its tooling by producing a model as if it were a pre-production 'shot'. It may sound a bit gimmicky, but I personally love it. As you may have noticed in my occasional Workbench feature, I really enjoy stripping back 'scrappers' to inspect the casting more closely, so this idea really works for me.

The releases are not just restricted to US subjects, as GreenLight's recent trio of *The Italian Job* Minis showed. As you can imagine, these are really small at 1/64, but they certainly carry plenty of detail.

Finally, one new range that is definitely worthy of mention here is a real departure for GreenLight. Battalion 64 is a military range of newly-tooled diecasts. The range is not just restricted to tanks, but we have the first two of these here. The detail is really rather good and I hope to see many more of these in the future. And that goes for the rest of GreenLight's range too, of course.

Next month, we travel further around the globe, taking in brands other than MINI GT in the Far East, returning to Europe to check out the growing scene back here too.



RESTORATIONS, CUSTOMS & NEW-BUILDS



Workbench

Rick Wilson shares his current project progress.

've been playing around with restoring old diecasts since my early teens. I've recently started a huge partwork project build from Ixo Collections and it gave me this idea for this section to bring you updates and tips as I focus on some other projects along the way too.

■CORGI TOYS NO 420 FORD THAMES "AIRBORNE" CARAVAN

A chance online conversation, a fair few months ago, with long-term subscriber and diecast enthusiast extraordinaire, Will Roe, led to him sending me his Corgi Toys No 420 Ford Thames Airborne for a respray. We settled on replicating the colour scheme featured on his homemade reproduction box.

Once the baseplate rivets had been drilled out, disassembly was a simple affair and the diecast components (body and rear doors) were treated to a caustic soda bath, then cleaned up with fine steel wool. Primed and then sprayed, with Ford Signal Yellow, the model was then put back together and detailed with a silver paint pen where appropriate. A quick and easy freshen up,

■FIAT 238 PARTWORK CODE 3S

To coincide with my article on the vintage Fiat 238 light vans, in the January 2022 issue, I bought a few extra models to have a little play with. Fiat's 238 is my favourite classic commercial vehicle, to the point where I'm actively hunting for an example to bring home one day. For now though, diecasts are filling the void – with these three, my collection swells to twenty-two 1/43 diecasts to sit alongside one Brekina 1/87 plastic model and a gorgeous 1/18 resincast minibus by LaudoRacing.

The trio were quickly dismantled to remove all the embellishments, so that meant removing the plastic roof panel, lights and chrome work detailing, and the interior and glazing unit. The stripped shells were then given the caustic soda treatment. The paintwork was impressively thick on these (especially compared to the Ford Thames caravan) and it took two goes to completely remove all of the paint from the Fiats.

Once fully stripped bare, the bodyshells were buffed with fine steel wool to remove any left over solution

residue. These were then primed with spray cans bought from Halfords (grey primer for the red and white for the yellow) and then top-coated with more car colours - Fiat Passadoble Passion Red and the same Ford Signal Yellow used on the Ford Thames.

Once fully dry, the roofs were reattached to the bodies and all the detailing components refitted. Then it was decal time for the two service vans, with both sets of decals being purchased on ebay. In the past, I have made my own for certain projects, and talking with various collectors at toy fairs and shows, it seems that many of you are a little intimidated by the process. 
■ IXO COLLECTIONS 1/8 SCALE PORSCHE 917KH PARTWORK KIT

It has been a little while since my last update, due to the global shipping problems. Over the last few weeks, two more boxes have arrived, which equates to 8 instalments, so another 20% in terms of progress compared to where we were at last time. The latest deliveries bring us to exactly halfway.

For this update, parts 41 to 48 have brought us more components for the rear of the tubular spaceframe chassis, meaning that the mighty flat-12 engine is now fixed in place and that the spaceframe can be built around it to fully encase it. The chassis is completely made up of diecast sections, so this whole build is starting to get really heavy.

Towards the front, there have been a couple of extra tie-bar struts to the suspension, but the main development is to the electrical wiring, allowing the testing of the connectivity. The car now has working lights, front and rear, and a small speaker that plays a start up engine noise sequence. The sound is a little 'tinny', so I'm tempted to try to locate a different spec unit for a more throaty, woody sound.



he 70th anniversary of the Land-Rover launch on 30 April 1948 at the Amsterdam Motor Show was marked by my account of the initial 1948-49 80" releases in 1/43 scale from Oxford, Corgi/Vanguards and Century Dragon (June 2018 issue), mostly depicting HUE 166, the famous first full prototype.

As explained previously, the aluminium-bodied Land-Rover (officially hyphenated until 1979) was a stop-gap project. Initial plans envisaged a run of 500 selling at £450, but surging demand at home and abroad meant ambitions rapidly expanded. Early production used surplus sage green cockpit paint from the Avro Anson, and other shades followed, depending on what supplies could be scrounged until an MoD order for 1,878 vehicles, in May 1949, triggered the darker Bronze Green standardisation.

This defines both the opening for this resumption and the start of longer-term development to remedy some initial ad hoc elements. The headlights originally sat behind a square-ish and denselymeshed grille across the inset front panel to disguise their cheapness, with sidelights located on the bulkhead below the windscreen. The first external revisions in October 1950 brought exposed headlights protruding through a new grille with larger mesh and a detachable rear tow bar, but the sidelights remained on the bulkhead; this version

only explicitly occurs on one Matchbox-Dinky model, but was wrongly linked in the first article to the next phase in June 1951.

This brought larger headlights separated from a smaller inverted T-shape grille, a mirror on the wing, outside door handles and moved the sidelights to the front of the wings, and is an extensively modelled format. Two months later the original 1,595cc engine was expanded to 1,997cc, but without external differentiation. After a production total of 77,680, the 80" was replaced in August 1953 by the 86" and the first LWB version as the 107" pick-up. Easy references for the SWB changeover are the slanted rear edge to the doors on the 80" which became vertical for the 86".

In October 1948 a 7-seater Station Wagon was commissioned from Tickford, with fully enclosed aluminium bodywork over a mahogany frame. Only 641 were sold until mid-1951, mainly overseas with early examples in Sage Green, an option from mid-1949 of Sage Green over Bronze Green and a final run in all-over Bronze Green; it received the 1950 headlight change but not the 1951 revamp.

THE MODELS

Four manufacturers have offered 80" models since the late 1980s; many other models exist in 1/43 from earlier years, but these were later versions with longer wheelbases. The quartet is shown in

the table, with the second column showing all 80" release numbers across both articles, including the 1948-49 sage green liveries discussed previously. The Vanguards models will be covered in more detail in the second part of this update, in the next issue.

Oxford's casting trails some way behind as the proportions are too tall and boxy, along with insufficient cut-off at the door bottoms and unduly rounded wheel arches. This suggests a bodged 88" casting rather than full tooling, with reduced and simpler detailing, but this was always a cheaper range. Matchbox-Dinky's casting is older and clumsier with exaggerated cabin pillars and simplistic shiny chrome, but there is enough careful detail to match a budget toy today, so it still deserves respect.

RAC LIVERY (KAD 265)

Both Oxford and Vanguards modelled the same vehicle, an April 1950 soft-top, which was dark green after a 1990s renovation until a parts theft in 2010. This triggered a restoration in replica RAC livery with hard top, which was widely shown from 2012 and matches the Oxford release date, although has since been returned to dark green. Oxford's (LAN180006) clumsy proportions and simpler detail are evident and its dark shade of RAC blue is dull. However, the complex livery with logos, and everything included, matches photos of KAD 265 in this guise. The launch blurb had a spotlight on the front bumper, but it arrived without one. Vanguards included the spotlight on its 2017 release (VA11116), with enhanced detail and a more convincing blue, so, with the better shape, it wins this comparison.

AA LIVERIES

Matchbox-Dinky (DY9b), Oxford (LAN180003) and Vanguards (VA11108) all feature the initial headlights behind the grille format. DY9b has KGW 580 plates from an ex-AA survivor registered in June 1949, although it seems to have now become an ordinary green. For a nearly 30-year old model, the standard is fairly high with most of the appropriate detail, but the over-emphasised plastic cabin looks heavy with small windows and the front grille is very basic. Oxford's depiction has no canvas back or door screens, and with the flat-folded windscreen resembles a sporty buggy more than a serious rescue vehicle; the open rear load bed has no extra fittings so it's difficult to see this as a convincing AA replica. That said, it has better proportions without the boxy cabin and the delicate trim highlighting works well.

Vanguards provide a removable canvas top without side-screens, resembling Oxford's buggy-like appearance although its windscreen is fixed upright. KLX 770 is a genuine ex-AA 1949 example displayed at Coventry Transport Museum and very accurately detailed. As the newest of the trio, Corgi could again benchmark the others, and the result is another win.

RAF LIVERY (43AA83)

The Armed Forces enthusiastically adopted Land-Rovers from 1950 with RAF use for assorted airfield duties. Again Vanguards (VA11106) piggy-backed an earlier Oxford (LAN180004) for an open-headlight 2-litre with 43AA83 plates which entered service in January 1953 and is a well-known restored

survivor, and have produced the better model. The Oxford's ink-blue RAF colouring and basic detail is fairly unexciting, its green canvas sags like a waterlogged tent, and the cheap toy-like front grille is disappointing. Vanguards added screen deflectors and subtle elements including tyre pressure stickers above each wheel to make the best of a livery with limited aesthetic potential and its all-over brighter blue is prettier if less authentic.

ARMY LIVERY (BEIGE)

Another showdown comes with similar depictions of open headlight models. Oxford's example (LAN180008) from the 34th Light AA Regiment has 36AA21 plates and is an unexciting livery. Its fully enclosed cabin and canvas top seem slightly unconvincing for the hot country use implied by the sand-like colour and the unadorned sides are very bland although front and rear insignia are neatly done. Vanguards chose VA11107 from the Suffolk Regiment as deployed to Cyprus in 1956-59 with 35AA20 plates, but was originally announced with 73BP47 as shown on the box lid. The green canvas top gives some colour interest and, without sidescreens, looks more credible; the better shape, extra detailing and highlighting and a good front grille again give this one to Vanguards.

ROYAL PARADE VEHICLES

This heading pairs two diverse examples, including a coachbuilt parade vehicle which may not actually qualify as an 80". The definite contender comes

from Vanguards (VA11109) as a dark blue open version in Royal Navy colours with 19RN65 plates and HMS Albion insignia, and marks the visit by the Queen and Duke of Edinburgh to this aircraft carrier at Invergordon on 28 May 1957 and their review of the crew lined up in ranks on the flight deck. As presented, this is a simple buggy which might be carried on board for miscellaneous duties, but archive photos show a proper viewing platform with screens, handrails and a deep full-width tailboard. It is unclear whether this was therefore an early vehicle from the royal fleet or a navy runabout; the registration is not a reliable clue as many royal events in the 1950s used Landies with Forces plates.

TrueScale Miniatures' resin model (TSM124379) is described as a '1954 88" Royal Review' despite the 88" not arriving until 1956. It seems that four Royal Review Land-Rovers, known as State I/II/ III/IV', were coachbuilt by Rover in 1953-54 for the Royal Commonwealth Tour; the date range overlaps the late 80" to early 86" transition. Their colours included the royal household's claret livery and, for State III at least, navy blue, with raised viewing platforms providing sidescreens, handrails and foldaway seats. The high proportions and short body make it difficult to gauge the wheelbase, although the vertical rear edge to the doors implies an 86". Whichever version this was, it is an intriguing model in an elegant scheme with much unique detail.TSM has issued several very detailed 1950s onwards Land-Rovers in a diverse and fascinating range.

MATCHBOX-DINKY RANGE REVIEW

The story now focuses on each manufacturer's range, starting with the 1989-99 Matchbox-Dinky Collection which included an 80" as an early release (DY9) with two liveries before Tyco's buy-out in 1992 and switch to mail-order distribution, usually in themed series. These used M-D castings for small re-engineered editions and continued under Mattel ownership from 1998, with DY9 having several reincarnations.

DY9a was a straightforward civilian livery in Bronze Green with a full beige canvas top and cast-in, but unpainted, EDP 999 plates from a 1950 80", which survives today, and, in 1989, had the distinction of being under single ownership for almost all its 40 years. Portrayed with the headlights correctly behind the simple grille, it is neatly shaped and proportioned with a fair bit of detail, although the minimal paint highlighting underplays these inclusions. Apart from the heavy-handed cabin with thick protruding pillars, it's fine for a 30 year old model. Oddly it has two spare wheels, on the bonnet and inside the cabin attached to the bulkhead. No definite production figure is known, but early Matchbox–Dinkys usually had runs of about 60,000.

The high production level and possible unsold stock may explain two DY9a variations. The first was found at the Falkirk swapmeet a few years ago in a normal box with North Ayrshire Council logos on the doors and precisely painted highlighting for the rear lights, number plates, wheel bolts, and mudflap logos. Presumably this is a home-improved one-off, unless anyone has a better explanation.

The second was listed in 2014 on ebay as a cancelled promotional in normal DY9a colours, with square RSPB logos on the canvas sides and RSPB/Land Rover "Partners in Conservation" door roundels. The solitary photo showed a boxed side-on view through the cellophane, with no other information or date.

DY9b was covered in the comparison of AA liveries, and is a simple recolouring of DY9a without other changes. Jumping forward in the sequence to YYM35054 as the last 'normal' offering shows a heavily tweaked dark green civilian version with

chunky tyres, a robust front PTO winch, and extra bits and highlighting to emphasise the baseplate drivetrain. Several trim features are carefully picked out and the result is a macho beast for conquering severe terrain. It is also unique for showing the October 1950 to June 1951 grille with protruding headlights, and has sprouted a rear tow-hook.

The other Matchbox Collectibles offerings are substantially reworked and sometimes embellished to a ludicrous extent, which makes them questionable acquisitions and therefore absent from my collection. The first absentee is YYM38052 in UK Pheasant Club (Kingswood) livery. This brash black and red release is similar to YYM35054 for the enhanced ruggedness fixtures, but introduces the utility-style Truck Cab option with a short hardtop and open rear bed, which was a poor-selling permutation in SWB form. Further additions include a massive light bar high above the cabin, chromed wheels, and the load bed is kitted out with a gun rack, a cool box with bottles of what might be champagne, and a model dog to match the retriever graphic on the body sides. The result is spectacularly garish and it is difficult to imagine such a top-heavy creation successfully careering around Cornish moorland in search of things to shoot.

However the illustrated 1952 Land Rover Auxiliary fire unit (YFE02) in red with trailer is far more credible and has been created with a delicate touch. Again the starting point is the Truck Cab with a simple red scheme, a front bumper locker, roof ladders and searchlight, a hose reel in the rear with side water tanks and a control panel on the tailgate. It has an open headlight grille, which matches the late 1951 Birmingham plate of LOP 652 and with the simple but neat trailer looks a very cohesive unit. Mine comes from the first batch issued in 1994 with a faintly printed grille, red wheels and "WORKS FIRE SERVICE" logos on the doors; three reissue batches during 1995-98 had chromed wheels but lost the door scripts. The possible identity of the original is intriguing as a Solihull plate would probably have been used for Land-Rover's own factory; an alternative is perhaps "the Austin" at Longbridge, whose vehicles always had Birmingham plates. The Austin Gipsy used for the later fire units

was not launched until 1958, so there was no brand conflict in the early 1950s.

YFE02/B 1952 Fire Truck "Old Londonderry" emerged in 1996 in an edition of 3,000, the only M-D model with a known batch size. Reflecting the phase of Australian ownership under Tyco, its yellow livery with white roof comes from New South Wales Bush Fire Brigade who used an ex-Australian army Land-Rover bought in 1972 that remained in service until 1984. It is a straightforward recolouring of YFE02 without significant alterations; there are no number plates, although the trailer still shows LOP 652. I have never seen one in the metal, but online photos suggest it would be an intriguing companion alongside the red YFE02.

Things get slightly weird for the final two models. The first was listed as a 1952 Royal Navy Rescue Truck numbered YYM35188 (1st batch) and YFE26

(2nd batch), although by all accounts are identical. Finished in Navy blue with genuine 68RN52 plates, it again uses the YFE02 short hardtop format and was originally intended to include a trailer carrying a dinghy. There is a new rear compartment with open equipment lockers, but a potentially excellent model is spoiled by a ridiculous amount of extra fixtures covering every surface, with an A-frame front hawser, massive grille bar, cables, ladders, lots of lights, horns, sirens and beacons, tool boxes and loads more. Even if these are authentic and their incorporation is a skilled manufacturing feat, the model looks shambolic.

YYM36400 is described as a Land Rover Rescue Vehicle and repeats everything in a red livery with TX-7426 plates from Sydney and "SURF PATROL" signwriting; with the Landie itself saturated, the fetish for overburdening clutter switched to the

reinstated trailer which to be fair is beautifully engineered with a hinged dinghy mounting. Despite its new purpose patrolling beaches, this hilarious ensemble retains fire ladders and hoses and ends up looking more like a clown's car going on holiday than a serious emergency vehicle; it's also questionable how rapid a response a real version could provide with so much added weight.

OXFORD DIECAST RANGE REVIEW

Oxford's range featured several variations of its pale green HUE 166 model (LAN180001) as discussed in the previous article, and the remaining releases are shown in the table.

LAN180003 (AA open), LAN180004 (RAF), LAN180006 (RAC) and LAN180008 (Army, beige) are discussed in the cross-range comparisons so not repeated here. LAN180002 is an open buggy with flat windscreen similar to LAN180003; its SSY 136 plates match a green survivor originally registered in June 1951, although was a DVLA reissue in the late 1990s. Its simple livery with cream wheels looks quite sporty for zipping round fields on a sunny day, and the uncertificated edition size was 2000.

LAN180007 was the Oxford Collectors Club Christmas 2010 model, in an edition of 3,348 with a livery of red body, green canopy and gold wheels. Another Land-Rover was issued as the 2011 Platinum model (LAN188018, edition size 2,832), using its 88" Series 2 casting in the usual Platinum livery of silver and dark blue, and is pictured for comparison. SP104 was a promotional for the 2015

Swansea Festival of Transport as an uncertificated edition with a dark green body, pale green cabin and wheels, and signwriting on the hardtop canopy.

The unexpected announcement, in June 2019, of a new Tickford Station Wagon casting is probably the first time this niche variation has ever been modelled in any scale, although unlikely to offer many permutations apart from different shades of green. Wearing an inaugural two-tone green livery for the first release (43TIC001), this is the mid-1949 Sage Green over Bronze Green option.

POSTSCRIPT – H166 HUE, THE LAST EVER LAND ROVER DEFENDER

The final proper Land Rover, when production ended on 29 January 2016, was a Grasmere Green 90" Defender Heritage Edition soft-top dressed up to replicate HUE 166, with H166 HUE publicity plates, and is displayed in the Gaydon collection alongside its ancestor. TSM's excellent model (TSM430217) enables a recreation of this first-and-last pairing, and shows how much — or how little depending on opinion — the Land-Rover evolved over 68 years and production of about 2 million examples. It has some disconcerting but accurate elements including an advanced grille with a hint of Toyota Land Cruiser, a raised windscreen, a bonnet bulge and white leather seats, and is illustrated alongside Century Dragon's superb HUE 166.

Next month, we conclude this update with a detailed look at the Vanguards releases.



Mike Pigott examines the history of this fascinating range of model trucks that originated in Greece.

reece is not a country that springs immediately to mind when thinking about diecast models. But like most European countries, Greece did have its own diecast industry from the 1960s to the 1990s. Probably the best-known diecast brands were Polfi Toys and Pilaz, although neither was known for high quality, as most products appeared to be unlicensed copies of foreign brands like Matchbox or Majorette.

Greece had a large thermoplastics industry, and most locally-made toys were made of polystyrene, the hard, brittle type of plastic. During the late 20th Century, there were myriad toy companies producing all kinds of plastic toys, including model vehicles. Manufacturers with names such as Plaggon Plast, Viozach, Apergis, Moustakas, Elvip and Kibi churned out a wide range of model cars and trucks of varying quality, but most were toylike and aimed at the juvenile market. Probably the most interesting ranges were two with very English-sounding names, Joy Toys and Play Trucks. Joy Toys made small plastic vehicles to around HO scale, and was of interest for producing trucks with mainly Bedford TK cabs. Play Trucks were larger-scale lorry and construction models that were significantly more realistic than those from other Greek manufacturers.

GAVRIELIDIS BROS

Play Trucks were produced by a company called Gavrielidis Brothers, based in Egaleo, an industrial outer suburb of Athens. It was founded in 1969 by Nikos Gavrielidis, and the products were sold under the name ▲ DAF Refrigerator Truck in Coca-Cola livery.

of Ellas Toys (Ellas being the Greek word for Greece). Like most Greek toy firms, it produced a wide range of plastic toys including dolls, building blocks, figures and toy guns, but is perhaps best known for large-scale, battery-operated plastic cars.

In the 1980s, the company began producing fairly realistic model trucks in hard polystyrene, which were similar in size to Matchbox Super Kings, being around 1/50 scale or slightly larger. The range consisted mostly of articulated lorries, plus a few rigid trucks and some other vehicle types that were mainly used as loads. Most of the models used one of two different truck cabs; the DAF 2600 and the Scania LS140, both extremely common vehicles in Europe at the time. The range was rounded out with a few construction vehicles and a helicopter.

My introduction to Play Trucks came during my first European package holiday in the late 1990s. I was staying on the Greek island of Crete, and a gift shop near my hotel had a whole wall full of Play Trucks, which looked very impressive in their clear packaging. I particularly liked the DAF trucks, which reminded me of the Matchbox Super Kings of my childhood. I bought a few, but was limited in the number I could buy due to baggage weight restrictions on budget airlines. I later tracked down the rest on the internet, but this took a long time.

Play Trucks were very popular with Greek boys who grew up in the 1980s and '90s, and are very highly regarded by collectors there today. Sadly, as they were made of polystyrene, they couldn't really stand up to rough play, so few unboxed examples survive.



LIMITED PALETTE

When looking at the complete range of Play Trucks, the most noticeable thing is the limited range of colours available. All of them are made from red, white, yellow and black plastic – with almost all of the truck cabs in red. There is nothing in blue, green, brown or purple at all, although some of them have grey, clear or chrome-plated parts.

The way polystyrene products are made is as follows; the raw material is provided as clear, colourless pellets. These are heated to a liquid consistency and fed into the die plates on the casting machines.

As soon as the dies are filled with the heated plastic, cold water is pumped into pipes in the machines which hardens the polystyrene, and the finished product is ejected from the press. To make coloured polystyrene, a powdered dye in the required shade is mixed with the clear pellets. If not enough dye was used, the plastic had a translucent finish.

So I really have no idea as to why Play Trucks were issued in such a small selection of colours. Were red and yellow dyes cheaper than other colours? Or was all the blue dye used for making Greek souvenirs?

A few components were made from polyethylene, or soft plastic; these were mostly small pieces in black or grey that needed a bit of 'give', such as the suspension. Some Play Trucks were left in self-coloured plastic, while others were painted, although strangely always in the same shades of red, orange, yellow and white.

DAF 2600

The DAF 2600 was introduced in 1962, and is widely regarded as the first modern truck. Designed around the driver, the boxy cab was comfortable and the large windows gave excellent all-round visibility. It was very popular in toy form with several models from Matchbox and Lion Toys. Matchbox had three versions of the DAF truck in the Super Kings range – a car transporter, house transporter and pallet truck, plus two in the miniatures line, these being a girder truck and a container truck.

Given the propensity of Greek toy companies to copy from other manufacturers, it's easy to jump to the conclusion that the Play Trucks DAF is a straight copy of the Matchbox version, particularly when the tractor is mated with the car transporter trailer. However, in my opinion they appear to be more 'inspired' by Matchbox rather than being straight-out copies. In some ways the Play Trucks version is superior; it has working steering, realistic wheels, a warning beacon on the roof and either a spare tyre or spoiler behind the cab. It is also constructed differently; on the Matchbox models the grille is part of the base, while the Greek models have a separate plated grille of a slightly different design that also forms the dashboard

and steering wheel. The turning front wheels are operated by a switch under the front bumper diguised as a towing hitch. Behind the cab is a box that acts as a spare wheel mount or the base for a roof spoiler; the spoiler could be in white or black plastic with a 'DAF' logo in red or gold. The wheels had chrome hubs with soft rubber tyres, and double-width wheels were fitted to the the tractor's rear axle and trailers, although these were not twin wheels. The axle units were attached to imitation leaf-springs which gave the trucks and trailers some rudimentary suspension. The axle ends appear to have been split manually using a hot blade to keep the wheels locked on. The cabs had white or cream interiors, while the glazing – which included the dome light – was in very pale amber.

CAR TRANSPORTER

This model used a red DAF cab with a spare tyre, matched to a car transporter trailer. The trailer is quite obviously based on the Matchbox car transporter, although it is not identical; it lacks imitation hydraulic rams and has extra curved struts. In addition, it featured fold-down jockey wheels and suspension. The lower deck and struts were yellow, while the upper deck and tailgate/ramp were red. The lower sides had black warning markings printed on them; this was not tampo printing, but a much more basic stamping process.

CONTAINER TRUCK

Another red truck with spare tyre, this model had a long flatbed trailer which was also painted red. The trailer had adjustable jockey wheels, and the decking featured a number of studs and slots. Included was a pair of shipping containers that could clip on to the raised studs on the trailer. The containers were painted white with red tops and opening doors; they also had studs on the top to allow them to be stacked up. Printed on the side was the logo for shipping company Transpa. Like many of the Play Trucks semi-trailers, this had a transfer on the rear bumper reading "LONC VEHICLE"; as there is no C or G in the Greek alphabet, this clearly caused confusion!

REFRIGERATOR TRUCK

A red DAF with a black spoiler, this came with a big refrigerated box trailer. The underside of the trailer was the same as the Container Truck, but was moulded in a deep yellow colour. The container box was painted white, and fitted with opening rear doors in yellow plastic, and a refrigeration unit at the front, also in yellow. Printed on the sides were Coca-Cola logos in red. This is one of the most sought-after Play Trucks, due to the large number of Coke collectors.

There was also a second version of this truck in

the livery of Olympic Airlines, the former Greek flag carrier. Instead of being in the dark blue and white colours of the airline, it was again in red with Olympic logos on the trailer. Reportedly, this was sold on board Olympic flights as a souvenir.

PIPE TRUCK

This model is largely similar to the Container Truck, but with a different load on the back. The example shown is painted an orangey-red, and fitted with a white cab spoiler. To be honest, this is probably the best model Pipe Truck ever made. Matchbox and Dinky made vehicles like this which were just loaded with long pipes. The Play Trucks version carries two different loads of very realistic pipes, held in place with black brackets. The front load consists of nine long pipes in lemon yellow, while the rear load consists of six short white pipes and twelve yellow elbow joints. The pipes can be removed and connected together. This is not an easy model to find, due to the pipes frequently being lost.

COVERED TRUCK

For a nice change, here is the only DAF truck not finished in red, but yellow. It is a Continental style low-sided lorry with tilt, described as "Freight Car" on the base. The trailer is a new casting, and fitted with a cream coloured tilt with a rolled-up rear curtain. Printed on the sides are logos for "Red Lines Ltd International Transport" in red and blue. I have seen versions of this in red (surprise!) with a yellow tilt.

PETROL TANKERThe next model is another to

The next model is another red DAF with a black spoiler, which is attached to a new petrol tanker trailer. The tanker is moulded in two parts; a white upper section which comprises most of the tank, and a lemon yellow base which includes the wheel arches and discharge outlets. A flip-down jockey wheel is fitted to the base, and the rear bumper has a label representing the tail lights and number plates. A yellow gangway is fitted to the top. Realistic Shell logos are printed on the sides, and there is a Shell label fitted to the rear of the tank, although the colours are not particularly accurate for a truck in this livery. This is the only model I own that features a blue component – the access ladder at the rear of the tank.

FIRE ENGINE

This DAF model was probably the least feasible – a European DAF truck cab towing an American-style articulated hook and ladder trailer. However, it had plenty of play value with lots of moving parts. The front-mounted, four-section ladder could rotate, raise by way of a thumbwheel, and extend quite impressively. The trailer was red and had swing-out stabiliser legs. The top of the trailer was white and included a support for the ladder. Fitted on top was a pair of hose reels, six traffic cones, plus removable ladders in side panniers. The cab was again red with a black spoiler.

BUILDING TRUCK

The final DAF truck was largely similar to the Pipe Truck but fitted with a different load. It had a white

plastic cradle on the back with six semi-circular indentations that were loaded with toy building discs. These were flat, circular construction discs shaped like daisies, that had eight slots in the circumference, which could be slotted together to make things; the discs were sometimes called 'Deeley Bobbers'. It was an attempt by Gavrielidis to combine Play Trucks with another of its toy lines. However, it was a poor mix because these discs could not be used to build anything realistic, and possibly girders or building bricks may have made a more appropriate load.

SCANIA LS140 SUPER

Play Trucks introduced a second truck cab in 1980, based on the Scania LS140 Super. It was a powerful truck with a 14-litre V8 engine under an angular, tip-forward bonnet. Although it had been introduced in 1972, it was much more modern-looking than the DAF and was quite common on Continental roads. It was a very powerful truck that was noted for its interior comfort and safety.

Again, the Play Trucks Scania looked to be inspired by a similar model from another manufacturer. This time it appeared to be based on a Scania semi trailer from the Majorette 'Serie 3000', a range of large-scale models similar to Matchbox Super Kings. However, it wasn't identical, as the Majorette trucks had opening bonnets and wing mirrors; the Play Trucks lacked these, but did have bumper-mounted indicators and suspension. A couple of the trailers, notably the boat transporter and long tanker, also looked rather similar to Serie 3000 models.

Unlike the DAF, the Scania was a three-axle tractor with a longer wheelbase, which meant the cab unit could also be used for rigid, short-wheelbase trucks. Two trailers were shared with the DAF, these being the long tanker and the fire engine, although there was a new low-loader trailer that was used for three different loads. There was also a medium-length articulated trailer introduced. Again, all of the trucks and components were finished in red, yellow, black and white. The exhaust pipes and bumper inserts were in black or grey, while the grilles were in black, grey or silver.

LONG PETROL TANKER

This was one of the two models to share a trailer with the DAF trucks, and the only Scania not to have a red cab. Again in a Shell livery, it had the same markings but now with a chrome gangway. The cab and underside of the trailer were in a much more golden shade of yellow, which made for a very realistic Shell tanker.

SCANIA FIRE ENGINE

The Scania cab was also matched with the fire trailer. As the Scania did not have a warning lamp on the roof, it was an even less convincing fire engine than the DAF. Early models were largely the same as the previous model, but later examples came with a white ladder and the hose reels and traffic cones in pale yellow.

BOAT TRANSPORTER

This model included a new multi-purpose low-loader trailer carrying an impressive luxury yacht. The trailer was a single-piece moulding with a hollow central well and twin rear wheels with suspension. It was painted yellow with black warning stripes along the centre. To transport the boat, a grey plastic cradle was fitted. The boat was a handsome looking craft with a white hull, red deck and roof, detailed yellow interior and clear glazing. A separate grey mast was clipped to the roof and could be mounted on a hole in the boat roof; there was also a small extending pole on the prow. The name of the yacht was printed on the side. The boat was not sold separately and did not float – the keel was not weighted.

CONSTRUCTION TRANSPORTER

The Construction Transporter was largely the same as the Boat Transporter, but was not fitted with a cradle. It was carrying a model of a Caterpillar Traxcavator. This excavator was also sold separately, and we will examine this model shortly.

HELICOPTER TRANSPORTER

Another Scania low-loader, this was transporting a slightly under-scale model of a Jet Ranger helicopter. This trailer was white with red markings; the trailer was slightly translucent, so presumably not enough white dye powder was used. A small stand was fitted to the gap in the centre of the trailer, and the helicopter's floats could clip on to these. The helicopter included was yellow with a black underside, although other colours have been seen. The chopper was sold separately, so will be shown in more detail later.



ARTICULATED TIPPER

The Scania cab was also mated to a pair of shorter articulated trailers. The first of these was a high-sided dumper mounted on a black, two-axle chassis. The dumper worked with an imitation hydraulic sleeve, and also had an opening tailgate. Unsurprisingly, the truck cab was red and the dumper bed was yellow, with the tailgate in black.

SHORT ARTICULATED TANKER

The second medium truck was another type of fuel tanker. It used the same black chassis as the tipper, but had no moving parts, and the tank was screwed to the base. The two-part tanker was white and had a chrome gangway on top. It featured red and blue decals for Mobil Super. This tanker had no discharge pipes, and may have been based on a truck used for transporting domestic heating fuel.

SHORT TIPPER

The longer, three-axle Scania cab was able to serve as as a short rigid truck, and Play Trucks produced two of these. The first was a short dumper, again in red with a yellow tipper. Instead of having a fifth-wheel coupling behind the cab, a small platform was fitted with hinges for the operating dumper bed and hydraulic ram.

CEMENT MIXER

The other short Scania was a cement mixer, and used the same tipping mechanism as the tipper. It was painted red, with a yellow cradle and a mixing drum in cream with red printed chevrons. Although slightly stubby, the model had a lot of play value; in addition to the tipping cradle, the barrel could rotate by means of turning a crank handle.

CRANE TRUCK

The only truck in the range that wasn't based on a DAF or a Scania was this large model of a mobile crane. On first impression, this appears to be copied from the Hercules Mobile Crane in the Matchbox Super Kings range; certainly the glassed-over engine behind the cab

is a Matchbox styling cue. However, it is actually quite different. The cab is much longer with two rows of seats and a steeply-raked windscreen. It is made of self-coloured yellow plastic, with the base, interior and most other parts in black. The glazing and roof lights are in clear plastic, as is the crane operator's cab windows. The hydraulic sleeve is the sole red piece.

This model can perform lots of actions. The crane rises by way of a thumb-wheel, and also has an extending three-part jib. In addition, the crane rotates and the base is fitted with four slide-out stabiliser struts. Included in the packaging was a red skip with a black handle; a slightly undersized load for a crane this size, but a nice touch for a bit of extra play value.

CATERPILLAR TRAXCAVATOR

This model was based on a tracked excavator made by American company Caterpillar. Although somewhat similar to a Matchbox King Size model, it had a number of differences – most notably the open bonnet sides with exposed engine and exhaust stack. The tractor was painted yellow with a red underside and black sub-base and axles. The driving wheels were red with black rubber tracks. The engine was chrome plastic, while the excavating arms were black and the shovel was red. This model had lots of play value, with a raising arms and tipping scoop, plus rolling treads. It was sold as a single model, in a twin pack with the short dumper, or with the Scania Low-Loader.

EXCAVATOR

The other excavator in the Play Trucks range was a more conventional hydraulic excavator. This does not seem to be copied from another toy manufacturer, and its slightly clumsy design does not really look like any real excavator, either. It has an unpainted yellow body

and chassis, black underside and cab roof, white arm and red shovel. The driving wheels are red with black rubber tracks. The 'digging' action is quite realistic, with three points of articulation and three sets of imitation hydraulic sleeves. 'Cat X-32' is printed on the arm in red, but the model is not based on a Caterpillar. It was sold singly or in a twin pack with the short dumper.

HELICOPTER

The only aircraft in the range was a model of a Bell Jet Ranger Helicopter, which was included as a load on the Scania Low-Loader and also sold separately. This model looked fairly similar to Corgi's Jet Ranger, and was a similar size, but had a number of differences including the engine and rotor mounting and the side windows. The helicopter could be found in red, orange or yellow, usually with a black underside and white interior. The spinning two-blade rotor could be found in white or black. The chopper had landing skids, but these were clipped into amphibious pontoons and could not be removed easily. Like a real helicopter, the pontoons had small wheels underneath them to allow them to be moved into a hangar.

PACKAGING AND SETS

Play Trucks came in a unique type of packaging - clear rectangular boxes with lift-off lids. The name "PLAY TRUCKS" was embossed on the underside of the lid; other than that there were few details about the brand other than a small sticker with the manufacturer's name and address.

There were three different box sizes: long, for the semi-trailers, medium for the helicopters and medium-sized trucks, and short for the short-wheelbase trucks. There were also lids with different depths, to accommodate taller models like the Boat Transporter and Cement Mixer. The helicopters were packed with a white plastic stand to hold them in place. There were also some twin packs; the short dumper could be included with the excavator or Traxcavator.

A large gift set was also produced. This was packed in a large cardboard window box with the models secured in a vac-form tray. The four models included in the set were DAF Fire Engine, Caterpillar Traxcavator, Scania Short Wheelbase Tipper and Crane Truck with Skip. The details on the box lid were in English, describing it as "King of the Road Gift Set Series – Authentic Models – Free Wheeling", so presumably this set was aimed at the tourist and export markets. The entire Play Trucks range was illustrated on the back of the box, which was quite useful as Gavrielidis / Hellas Toys never issued any form of catalogue.

Play Trucks are not easy to find today. The brittle polystyrene parts mean they were very susceptible to being broken with moderate play, and the clear boxes can shatter very easily. Some models are easier to find than others, with some of the DAF trucks being the most common.

Play Trucks were not widely exported outside of Greece, although a fair number seem to have been bought by tourists visiting there on holiday. Gavrielidis Toys closed down, at very short notice, some time in the late 1990s. Apparently, from time to time, Play Trucks can still be found in dusty old shops around Greece.



Jo Bonnier's last ride

It's been 50 years since the world of motor racing lost Jo Bonnier. **Rick Wilson** pays tribute to a racing legend.

on 31st January 1930. He began racing a motorcycle when he was 17, turning to rallying in his early twenties.

He entered Formula One in 1956, driving a Maserati, and would go on to drive for BRM, Porsche, Lotus, Honda, Cooper and Brabham (the last two under the Rob Walker Racing banner). He only won one Grand Prix, the 1959 Dutch GP at Zandvoort, driving a BRM P25. His last full season in F1 was 1968 and then he only raced occasionally over the next three years – the last two campaigning his privately-entered McLaren M7C, raced in his Ecurie Bonnier colours.

oakim Bonnier was born in Stockholm,

Bonnier was one of the driving forces behind the Grand Prix Drivers' Association, campaigning for driver safety. Jo was also a racing advisor to the 1966 motor racing epic, *Grand Prix*, starring James Garner.

By the early seventies, he had taken to managing his team, entering several cars in World Sportscar Championship events. Concentrating more and more on running the team rather than driving, he would, nevertheless, undertake driving duties during the longer races, such as Le Mans. He first raced at the legendary French circuit driving a Maserati, in 1957, taking part every year until 1966. He raced there again in 1969, '70 and '72. His best result was 2nd overall, driving a Ferrari 330P with Graham Hill, in 1964.

For 1972, Ecurie Bonnier had acquired the first two examples of Lola's pretty T280 (chassis HU1 and HU2), entered at Le Mans for 1970 winner Gerard Larousse

with Hughes de Fierlant (#7), and 1971 winner Gijs van Lennep with Jo (#8). Reflecting Bonnier's Swiss residency (he'd moved there in the mid-sixties), the yellow cars were adorned by graphics that made the cars look like a wedge of Swiss cheese!

The de Fierlant/Larrouse car succumbed to a burnt out clutch after just seven hours, but the van Lennep/Bonnier entry was running well, making up for time lost earlier in the race (gearbox problems and a high-speed tyre blowout). During the Sunday morning, with just six hours to go, Bonnier's open-topped Lola was up to 8th place when it collided with a Ferrari Daytona on the high-speed run between the Mulsanne and Indianapolis corners. The Lola was catapulted over the barriers and into the trees – Jo was killed instantly.

Solido released 1/43 scale models of both entries in period, complete with Swiss cheese markings. The French model maker frequently released models with the markings only part applied, for finishing at home, and this was the case with these two.

After Jo's death, Ecurie Bonnier raced for one more season and, for the 1973 Le Mans 24 Hours, HU1 raced as #61 – this was also released by Solido. More detailed and accurate versions of these T280s have since been released by Bizarre, but there is a certain charm to the vintage Solido examples. And charm is a word that always springs to mind when I remember that true gentleman racer, Joakim Bonnier.

umber 24 brings us three very different types of transport modes – a stylish luxury car, a racing car and a diesel locomotive. As always, there are some interesting variations to be found too.

ROLLS-ROYCE SILVER SHADOW

Catalogue: 1970-72 Box Styles: G

Another regular wheels turned Superfast, Silver Shadow kept its deep rich metallic red and stayed this way until being discontinued, making its final appearance in the 1972 catalogue. A popular model, and a good replication of the real thing, these are still fairly easy to find today in good condition for a reasonable price, unlike their real life counterparts of course.

TEAM MATCHBOXCatalogue: 1973-78

Box Styles: I

In the 1973 catalogue, it was announced that Matchbox was sponsoring a Formula 2 team headed by racing driver, and former World Motorcycle Champion, John Surtees. For the box artwork, the miniature Team Matchbox car was loosely based on the look of Surtees' car, in yellow. However, in production it was usually a deep metallic red, and sometimes metallic green (shades could vary). In reality, the model was closer to the Brabham team's 'lobster claw' BT34, so named thanks to the unique look of the car's front bodywork, as modelled on this Matchbox. The nose was adorned with a number 8 'Team Matchbox' decal.



The body is solid, with a large rear wing (similar to the Brabham BT34 again), and the unpainted base is quite detailed. There is a chromed, eight-cylinder engine at the rear, while the white plastic driver was a standard part used in several other racing cars.

The different variations of Team Matchbox have always caused collectors some confusion. Despite being pictured in the 1973 catalogue and on the 1972-type box in yellow, it was never issued individually in this colour. It did, however, appear in the standard red alongside a metallic light green version as part of the Team Matchbox "Superfast Champions" gift set. The rarest versions were released as part of the View-Master Grand Prix board game. It included four Team Matchbox models, in red and green plus two exclusives – a

metallic blue and a non-metallic yellow. These latter two were only available in this set, and rank amongst the rarest Superfasts. Race numbers can vary on these. The game included a View-Master viewer and four dual-imaged '3D' reels that featured actual photographs of Formula 1 racing from the late 1960s. These were meant to convey actions to be taken on the board with the Team Matchbox cars.

In 1978, Team Matchbox was included in the "Two" Packs range, where it was teamed with Field Car aboard a plastic towing component. Early versions were again metallic red, but with differently-styled No 44 stickers. The body colour was later changed to orange, also numbered 44, and this version is hard to find (I'm still hunting!).

DIESEL SHUNTER Catalogue: 1979-82 Box Styles: L

Diesel Shunter was a generic 0-4-0 yard locomotive and, being nearly fully diecast, was quite a heavy model. Appearing initially in metallic green with a red base, with red stickers to either side bearing the legend "RAIL FREIGHT" in white letters. This was quickly changed to "D1496-RF", presumably it was deemed to be more generic, so that it would be more suitable to sell in other countries, and the main body colour was later changed to yellow.

Diesel Shunter also featured in the "Two" Packs range (TP-20), where it was teamed with a model that wasn't released in the main 1-75 range – Side-Tipping Wagon. The tipping component of this was moulded in plastic and could either be red or black. The loco was also included in the marvellous Container Port (1978, although some later production runs featured plastic-moulded versions of the locomotive) and Railway Goods Yard (1979) playsets, with the latter also featuring Side-Tipping Wagon amongst its other vehicles.

Texaco Doodlebug

Never lost for things to talk about, Rick Wilson shares another selection from his collection.

t the beginning of the 1930s, Howard W. Kizer, a fleet manager for the American oil brand, Texas Co., known as Texaco, came up with an idea of how to modernise the image of heating fuels. He thought that tanker trucks were already a specially-built vehicle, so why not design a modern version that would capture the imagination of the people. The Texaco Doodlebug came about after the company hired the Bel Geddes design firm to refresh its entire brand and give it a more contemporary style. Updates included changes to the Texaco logo, gas station architecture and even the attendants' uniforms.

The Texaco Doodlebug was a peculiar-looking, special-bodied Diamond T tanker truck, and was an experiment in streamlining - a style of design that was proving popular at the time, as the understanding of aerodynamic benefits were beginning to be applied to road vehicles. The specially-fabricated bodies were constructed by truck body specialist, Heil Co. It was based on a Diamond T truck chassis and was unveiled to the public at the 1933 Century of Progress exhibition, in Chicago.

The Doodlebug featured a rear-mounted, sixcylinder engine, and the clutch and gearbox were actuated by air pressure. The positioning of the drivetrain meant that the cab was more spacious

and could be located lower down than in a conventional truck. Because the engine was at the opposite end of the vehicle, and the driver couldn't hear it, the Doodlebug had a small microphone in the engine bay connected to a speaker in the cab which allowed the driver to listen out for when to make a gear change.

The vehicle's styling was way ahead of its time. It didn't look like any truck that had been built before, or since for that matter. In keeping with the streamlining design theme, the Doodlebug was extremely aerodynamic for its size. Many of the features introduced on the vehicle were groundbreaking, such as the compound curved glass for the windscreen. Similar windscreens didn't go into mass production until the late 1950s. Each vehicle featured segmented tanks, so could carry either petrol or heating oil, or a combination of both in the separate vessels. The Doodlebug was also known to serve as an aircraft refueller, or at least there are period photos that exist demonstrating one refuelling a Douglas DC-3 to suggest such a scenario.

In addition to the striking, pill-shaped body, another aspect of the Texaco Doodlebug tanker that was surprising was its height - at 6 feet (1.8 metres) it was only marginally taller than a regular family car of the time. The truck was 26 feet (8 metres) in length. The actual number manufactured

is not known, although it is known that the original commission was for six vehicles. Several sources state that it was just the six examples of this incredible beast that were ever made, but what is known is that, sadly, none of them are around today.

After the introduction of the Texaco Doodlebug, several other US-based oil companies decided to create their own streamlined tanker trucks. Part of this craze was possibly due to the fact that the oil companies were trying to persuade the American public to ditch coal for heating their homes and move to oil. The thinking was that people would prefer a sleek, futuristic delivery vehicle rather than a conventional, dirty, noisy and old-fashioned truck.

What we have here is a rather fabulous, diecast replica with an unusual feature – it's actually a money box! Manufactured by Ertl, and released in 1994, the body is diecast, complete with cast-in raised lettering, with a plastic base that incorporates a removable panel to gain access to your savings when required. The wheel hubs are plastic, but the tyres are rubber – and very realistically-replicated indeed.

It is 20cm in length, which makes it roughly 1/40 scale. It cost me just a few pounds in October 2015, and was considerably cheaper than the superdetailed 1/43 scale resin cast by AutoCult (No 11000), released in September that year. In fact, I bought this as a direct result of searching for more information about the AutoCult release for a model review! Obviously, mine lacks much of the finery of the latter, but it has plenty of charm and is displayed prominently near my desk.

Interestingly, Bizarre has also manufactured a 1/43 scale resincast of the vehicle (No BZ1052). Both this and the AutoCult model still command serious coinage (more than the Ertl money box version can carry), so I think I'll stick with my bargain find!





Vauxhall Victor Estate

DTCA Chairman, Michael Driver, picks another vintage favourite by Dinky.

state cars have always fascinated me, as they were often adapted from an existing car in the manufacturer's range. Some of these seemed to be an ideal adaptation of the original car, whereas others were not so visually pleasing. Toy makers produced a variety of different estate cars to add to their ranges. Of course, Dinky Toys were no exception and a popular model was the Estate Car (No 27f/344), but this was based on an American Plymouth vehicle rather than an English vehicle.

A new estate car arrived in April 1963 as the Dinky Toys Vauxhall Victor Estate Car (No 141). The *Meccano Magazine* colour advert on the back page shows the estate and its opening tailgate, stating "A Victor for Vauxhall" and "Now a precision Dinky Toys model of it is at your dealers", suggesting you "Go and admire it today".

The review continues, "as I mentioned earlier, equipped with an opening tailgate, in addition to Presomatic steering, windows, interior fittings and 4-wheel suspension. The high-lustre yellow gloss colour scheme is particularly attractive and contrasts perfectly with the delightful blue interior. Although the rear seat in the prototype is collapsible, in our miniature it is permanently in the folded position so that those of you who obtain the model will have lots of fun fitting all sorts of luggage into the back of it". The model also has a silver-coloured radiator grille, headlamps and bumpers, and came in illustrated yellow card boxes. The wheels are chrome with treaded tyres. The model was deleted in 1967.

This model was also one of a number of Dinky Toys assembled in South Africa during the 1960s due to import restrictions. The colours were pink, ivory and yellow all with the blue plastic interiors.

The boxes are the standard English ones but had descriptions in English and Afrikaans.

There is also a promotional version produced for Lightning Fasteners Ltd. This comes in maroon with a blue interior. On the sides are labels with the wording "Lightning Fasteners Ltd – Technical Services". The company produced zip fasteners and was based in Birmingham.

In July 1964, the model was converted into The Dinky Toys Vauxhall Victor Ambulance (No 278). The model is in white with red crosses on the front doors. Additionally, there was a roof storage compartment with a blue light with "Ambulance" in white on a black background. With the model comes a uniformed driver and a patient on a stretcher. It has a yellow illustrated card end flap box and was deleted in 1970. The actual ambulance was produced by Martin Walter of Folkstone.

The Vauxhall Victor Estate was developed from the car that had a four-cylinder engine giving a top speed of around 80mph. The cars styling was more refined than its predecessor, the Victor F series, and it had a larger interior. There was also a sporty version with twin-carbs and a high compression engine.



THE specialist sale held at Vectis Auctions, in Thornaby, on 10th May featured a large assortment of diecast models from Corgi and Dinky, including boxed and unboxed model cars, commercials, trucks, military vehicles, cabinets and Gift Sets. Further items in the sale included part 2 of The Hector Hamer Collection, tractors and farm vehicles from Britains, Joal NZG and many others. Part 1 of The Swindon Collection included further Britains tractors, plus trade packs, and models from ERTL, Brian Norman Farm Miniatures and many more, and a further private owner collection featured more Corgi and Dinky models, empty boxes, Crescent Toys and Spot On. The sale also included TV & film-related items, James Bond memorabilia, plus British Continental and foreign-made diecast vehicles.

The Vanguard and the Vulcan

Andrew Ralston considers Standards in the RAF.

or anyone interested in the history of aerial warfare, a visit to the RAF Museum in Hendon, London, is a must, but there's much for car enthusiasts to see as well. Underneath the wings of one of the most impressive exhibits, the massive 1950s Avro Vulcan V-bomber – designed to carry Britain's nuclear deterrent 'Blue Steel' missiles – lies a selection of service vehicles, and one of them is a Standard Vanguard painted in RAF blue-grey livery. These were originally used to ferry the crew across the runway to their aircraft, and one officer who served during the Cold War era recalls a driver parking the car rather too close to the plane. Once the mighty Olympia jet engines fired up, the Vanguard was blown across the runway!

Vanguard saloons, pick-ups, Ensigns and other cars from the Standard-Triumph stable were much favoured by the RAF. No doubt a Ford Zephyr or an Austin Cambridge could have transported pilots to their planes just as effectively, but the fact that Arthur, Lord Tedder (1890-1967), the chairman of the Standard Motor Company between 1956 and 1960, had previously been Chief of the Air Staff – in other words, head of the RAF – had something to do with Standards being the vehicles of choice. The Standard factory also carried out some of the maintenance on aircraft engines.

The most familiar diecast model of an RAF Vanguard comes from Corgi Toys and was produced between 1958 and 1962, finished in RAF blue with roundels and, of course, fitted with that special selling feature of Corgi Toys, window glazing. While not the rarest of 1950s diecast models, the Corgi RAF Vanguard is still quite an expensive item and in mint condition with original box is likely to cost you up to £,100 today.

More affordable, albeit in a smaller scale, are the two more recent offerings from Oxford Diecast in its 1/76 scale range. While the Corgi represents the post-1955 Phase III Vanguard, the Oxford is based on the earlier Phase I car – with the distinctive round rear as designed by Walter Belgrove and said to be influenced by a Plymouth he sketched while

it was parked outside the American Embassy in London. The Oxford model carries the more ornate grille fitted from 1952 onwards and certainly captures the bulbous shape of the Vanguard very convincingly. It was first issued in 'civilian' guise in black, light blue and maroon, followed by a fourth variant in RAF blue – based on the very car on show at Hendon and carrying the same number plate, 55 AB 66. The latest issue is in a sand colour, with a white roof, representing Vanguard 74 AD 95 as used at the RAF headquarters in Nicosia Cyprus during the fifties

Keen modellers could replicate a scene from a fifties RAF base by placing the Vanguard beside a model of a Vulcan bomber which is available in a compatible scale in diecast form from Corgi and as a plastic kit from Airfix. Even

when scaled down to OO gauge, the wing span of the Vulcan stretches to as much

as 18.5 inches. The model
in the picture is by
Atlas Editions in
1/144 scale (in other
words, half the scale
of the Vanguard), but
the car still looks
dwarfed by it!

FUN WITH FIATS

I enjoyed Andrew Ralston's article on Minialuxe and thought I'd take the opportunity to show my examples of its Fiat 124 Special and Fiat-Siata 1500 TS. The base of the Siata is quite a different construction to the 124 and the body has warped slightly with age making it look banana-like, but it's a great little model of a very rare car. The Minialuxe 124 Special is a very important model for Fiat collectors as it's one of only two 1/43 models of the Special version which differed from the normal 124 Saloon by having twin headlights and an engine similar to the 124 Coupe. The Minialuxe version is, in my opinion, the best (even if the grille is a little wonky!) as the other one from Italian company Mebetoys just doesn't look right and it's not acknowledged as being a Special, just being a hasty conversion from the original standard 124 casting. The Minialuxe 124S has always been a favourite model of mine, like the real car, and I'm mystified as to why it's been ignored by the model world. It would look fantastic as a 1/18th Laudoracing model.

Too young?

Stephen Paul Hardy continues with his iterative thought process

he problem with iterative anything is that, by definition, it is an ongoing process. In this case, pondering on the bottomless well of the 'toy or model' debate that I fell into last month.

I am looking forward to seeing (and reviewing) Solido's imminent new range of 1/43 scale models, which will arrive concurrent with another new range it is releasing: "My 1st Solido". I cannot for one moment, though, imagine that, unlike the forthcoming 1/43s, a review of the first releases in that other range would be acceptable in Diecast Collector.

Setting aside the material they are made from, why then would they be viewed unfavourably? After all, quite a few 1970s diecasts that certainly fall absolutely into the toy category grace these pages regularly.

I looked again at the press info: "An excellent way to pass on your love of cars and miniatures to your child from an early age... Our models have original names that are a reference to the world of cars. The two 'My 1st Solido' car shapes (Racer or Roadster)

each represent a different automotive style: a racing car from the 1930s or a German speedster from the 1950s."The accompanying photo of that 1950s speedster is unquestionably a Porsche 356.

Then the penny dropped. We are slewed and skewed by our collective prejudices, preferences and self-imposed boundaries on the subject. Analysis of prevailing perceptions suggest that the defining factor is how old the toy is. If it is a vintage toy it seems generally acceptable as the subject of a magazine article for collectors. If it is a brand new toy – not so much. So the boundary then sits at the toy being vintage before being considered as worthwhile feature material?

But a whole other world of debate focuses on defining "vintage", "retro" and, in automotive circles, "classic" as well. At this point I threw the towel in. I kind of like "Gordon Blue" (S9900201), aka the 356 Speedster, even if I can't write a review about it.
