


















I sprinkled sand particles of different sizes on the ground to simulate the texture of the land, and put gypsum buildings around the ship to simulate the scene of ruins.

The placement can be relatively free, and the gap can be filled with a mixture of sand and gypsum.
































The bricks are a plaster cast with the addition of a dye. In addition, in the modeling warehouse I found some resin boxes, a barrel and other accessories.

The base of the stand was made of 6 cm thick polystyrene, which I cut to a size of 21.5 x 18 cm. I glued a plaster cast of cobblestones to it with a universal polymer glue. I covered the sides with 1 mm thick HIPS by putting it to the stand and tracing the dimensions with a pencil.

I applied a little tile adhesive to the modeled base and then started the "rubble" process. I glued the boxes and barrels first. Later, I pressed the largest pieces of rubble into the glue. Next were medium and small fragments of rubble and bricks. Finally, I covered the tiniest fraction. To make the whole thing stronger, I used carpentry glue diluted to the consistency of milk with a few drops of dishwashing liquid.

The McDonnell Douglas F/A-18 Hornet, is a fourth-generation twin-engine multirole fighter of American origin with allweather capability, to be embarked on aircraft carriers. It was developed in the 1970s by the McDonnell Douglas company from the Northrop YF-17 prototype for the United States Navy and United States Marine Corps.

In May 1983 Spain signed a contract with the US to acquire the F-18, it was a fighter that even in the US marked a new



era. It was very low cost to maintain, despite all its technology. Its advances brought out details never seen before, such as the voice responses of the abort computer, digital control screens (instead of traditional clocks) and an excellent combat load capacity of 25,400 Kg (higher than the Eurofigther!) . In July 1986 the first Hornets were received at the Zaragoza Air Base, Wing 15.

The delivery of the entire lot would end in 1990, in Torrejón de Ardoz, Madrid, in Wing 12. Four years later, Spain requested new units from the US. The Americans send 24 second-hand fighters from the US Navy, which would be integrated into the Morón (Seville) and Gando (Canary Islands) Air Bases.
























MODEL KIT. As a fan of jet aircraft models, one of the schemes that I like the most and that break the gray color of low visibility that all modern combat jets carry are the "aggressors". Diving through the internet I found this photo of an F-18B with an aggressor scheme in a tritonal green-light graydark green that I immediately fell in love with, it belongs to the Marine Squadron VF-125 Rought Raiders.

Often, a new squadron will assume the nickname, insignia, and traditions of earlier squadrons, but officially, the US Navy does not recognize a direct lineage with disestablished squadrons if a new squadron is formed with the same designation.

VFA-125 received its first aircraft in April 1981, and by March 1985, had amassed over 30,000 mishap-free flight hours in the Hornet.

On 1 October 2010, VFA-125 was deactivated as an F/A-18 Fleet Replacement Squadron, and its aircraft and personnel were incorporated into VFA-122.

In Greek mythology, Charon is the ferryman of Hades, the one in charge of guiding the wandering shadows of the recently deceased from one side of the Acheron river to the other if they had an obolus to pay for the trip, which is why in Ancient Greece the corpses they were buried with a coin under their tongue, a custom imported later in Ancient Rome, where the character was also venerated. Those who could not pay had to wander

the banks of Acheron for a hundred years, after which Charon agreed to take them free of charge. Charon is a character from late sources in mythology. Although it is often said that he carried the souls down the river Styx, as suggested by Virgil in his Aeneid, according to most sources including Pausanias and later Dante the river that Charon actually traveled was the Acheron.

Although no source has transmitted his affiliation to us, Charon is usually implicitly imagined as the son of Erebus and Nyx. He was depicted as a skinny, grumpy old man in dark robes and a mask (or sometimes as a winged demon with a double hammer) choosing his passengers from the crowds that lined the shore of Acheron, from among those who they deserved a proper burial and could afford the trip (between one and three obols).













INTRODUCTION: With the arrival of 3D Printers at the home level, more and more houses are providing their models for each artist to print and work with. This is the case of Loot Studio which, through its Patreon, released this spectacular figure of the boatman Charon that made me fall in love from the first hour.

APPROACH AND CREATION OF THE SCENE: The first thing that was clear to me about the scene was that it would be represented in the middle of a storm in the Styx Lagoon. To do this, on the base I printed part of the base that came with the figure itself, taking out only the souls to place them in the water. Once placed with putty I shaped the entire storm. Once with the whole scene raised I started the painting.

CHARON PAINTING: For Boatman himself he wanted some whitish tones on the skin to give the spectral sensation, not human or alive. I started by painting the skin with a base color of Tierra de Vallejo, after that I started adding highlights, the first with Tierra, Iraqi Sand, Vallejo Covered Brown and shading with AK Burnt Umber and Vallejo Prussian Blue. The tunic when going in black color I started with a base of black, going up with dense Pale Blue and Pale Grey.

PAINTING AND PUTTY OF THE BOAT:

Before starting to paint I wanted to introduce the figure a little more in the character it represented. For this I remembered the classic phrase of "a bribe for the boatman". So it was clear to him that the boat had to have many











coins lying all over the deck. Using multi-component green putty, I filled the entire deck with small coins. For AK's Leather Brown paint. And from there I started with washes of different inks like green, brown, black. Adding some washes with Green Stuff Intensity inks to give color intensity. After that I started lighting with Chocolate Brown, Matte Sand, among others, marking veins and outlining areas of the wood.

LIGHTING: I wanted the figure to have two types of lighting, on the one hand the natural ambient lighting of the place, a bit dark at the same time. Here I used a bit of bluish and green tones to give that gloomy feel. And on the other hand, the light given off by the headlight, somewhat warmer than it would be only in the front part, here I used yellow and orange tones. Lightly reflected in the figure itself.

BASE: For the base, as we mentioned before, I used modeling putty or clay, to create the base form where the boat would rest, in it I buried the figures of the souls to simulate that they came out of the water. Once dry, I started painting, I wanted it to be a dark and bluish tone so I used turquoise and greenish colors for all the water.

However, I saw that it needed something more and I decided to put a background that would give it depth, so I searched and printed the perfect background for the sea. I glued it on a sheet of Plasticard and from there to the base.


Once glued and dry, I prepared to adapt and incorporate the bottom with the water itself, to do this I used the AK Water Gel to, apart from simulating the final waves that the water would have, cover the joints between the bottom and the base.

For the splashes of water that were next to the boat, I used Green Stuff UV resin which I placed on a kitchen cling film to give the shape of crashing water and dried with its light.

After that I placed it around the boat. I finished giving some touches of paint in some areas and went over all the water and the boat with ceramic varnish to give it a wet feel.

The first step has been to apply a gray primer. After priming I have started with the passage areas of the

chains and the running gear. As I said before, in this area I have chosen to pre-shade and pre-panel, then apply a thin layer of paint in the lightest color of the scheme. After that I applied a wash with a dark brown color.

For the wheels I have followed the same steps as in the previous area, and I have also applied several washes with very highly diluted light earthy colored oils, allowing them to accumulate in certain areas so that once the oil is dry it represents accumulated dust. Before mounting the wheels I have also applied several washes with light earthy colored oils very very diluted in the area where the chains and running gear pass.

After that, and once the oil was dry, I applied pigments in the dust accumulation areas, fixing it with White Spirit and cleaning the excess afterwards, once the White Spirit was dry.

The assembly of the chains has been somewhat laborious, but it has been worth it for the final result.

The painting has also been somewhat laborious. For the outer face I have painted the whole with NATO green and then I have masked to paint the rubber pads black, since the intention is that, when going on asphalt, they are quite dark due to friction with it. With the inner face I have done the same, but changing the order of the colors and then with the dry brush technique some raw metal wear in the friction areas to represent the accumulation of dust I have applied oils as in the previous steps.

> Next, I have mounted the chains in place, finishing off the bottom of the cart barge.

> It is the turn of the top of the barge and the tower. The process has been the same in both cases.













We painted some of the objects that will be placed in the scene under an old canvas. We will make the canvas that covers the drum, motor, bottles, etc; with TAMIYA brand bicomponent putty, which we will paint in gray-brown color after it has hardened. For the diorama trees, we will place two references of different shades of the MODEL SCENE brand. In the tree that we have placed previously,

we are going to put a bird's nest with eggs from the MAN-TIS Miniatures brand. To make the stream we will use bicomponent resin, and then to simulate the movement of water we will use the Water Texture reference from the VALLEJO brand. Three of the animals that will appear in the diorama, an otter, a woodpecker and a hedgehog, all of them from the MANTIS Miniatures brand. To make

the ferns, we used the reference VG3-001 of the MODEL SCENE brand, which we painted with different shades of green, as well as some nettles of the same brand, reference VG3-019. We are now going to make the tree that will be located uprooted by the wind on the ground, whose roots will be seen.




The lower part to simulate the root ball, we will place a piece of DAS paste on a natural trunk collected in the field, then we will paint it and apply different shades of acrylic washes. We will then place the simulated roots with the Small Fine Lichen reference from LAND-SCAPES Detail.

We have made the reeds of the stream by hand with products from nature.

We made a wooden fence with the typical ice cream sticks that are sold in Asian bazaars, to which we have given texture with a metal bristle brush. Then we will paint it with colors simulating old wood.




