THE MODEL: For me, this model is undoubtedly a product of the year 2022. Many were waiting for it and me, and when it appeared on my workshop table, it was a pure pleasure to build it. Tamiya did a great job.

The only uncertain moment was when mounting the canvas cover to the turret and this is not only my observation, but also others. In general the whole construction took me 3 days. Of course, not 12 hours a day, but several hours and you could probably do it in 2 days, but what's the hurry.

After all, there must be some joy in this game right?

Besides, I almost completely skipped building the interior. I do not like to waste time on this stage of modeling, besides my idea is to cover the fighting compartment with tarpaulins protected against rain and generally bad weather.

Yes, I know some people may be disappointed, but my laziness has won out. It significantly shortened the construction time.

Of course, before that, I collected some photos from the Internet to see what I can improve OR REBUILT on the model.

My plan was to make the vehicle out of the direct combat line so the crew will be relaxed and the whole scene will be placed with some elements of rural surroundings.

The Hellcat model requires a little extra work if it is to be personalized and unique. A large number of accessories undoubtedly builds the right message and tells a story. Despite the fact that the model straight from the box would be undoubtedly correct, the replacement of some elements is natural and does not raise any doubts.







In addition, while analyzing photos of vehicles from the war period, I observed several field modifications and arrangements of the equipment that I used in my model - it is primarily the installation of additional fuel tanks. Generally Hellcat should not be the easiest models to cover by stowage, but you can do it and that to make it look interesting.

Before painting, the whole thing was disassembled to the first elements and prepared for cleaning.













DIORAMA: I did not think too long about building an oval base because a broken clock came into my hands by accident, which was perfect for this purpose. I threw in a broken mechanism and glass. I filled the center with foam, covered the bottom and glued soft pads. From a piece of cork, I built concrete slabs that were covered with a ready-to-use product made of AK - Concrete.














the Dio Dump kit. Its construction is very simple and it will enrich the entire stand. I painted it with acrylic paints and the mortar was made of plaster, the excess of which I wiped off with my finger, and the rest that remained between bricks preserved with water.

I painted the traces of tracks on the surface of concrete slabs with acrylic paints, first I made a model trace with the tracks that I had in the set.

The masking tape allowed me to keep straight lines when painting.

When mounted on the stand, the shed looks perfect. Its construction allows it to be viewed from all sides and it has no dead zones without a mapped structure of bricks or boards. Laser cut leaves harmonize with the tree and introduce a bit of autumn climate to the appearance of the entire stand. Barrels and jerry cans are the main element visible on the first glance at the base.

They are painted in various color finishes and have various inscriptions embossed on the covers. I used several sets from the Eureka XXL for this. In addition, I enriched the jke with small fuel and oil leaks. The random positioning of all the tanks is thoughtful and only seemingly chaotic. Each element builds the right composition.

In addition to the dusty barrels and jerry cans, I also put in some colored cans for contrast. They are from the Plus Model kit. Due to the roughness of the ground, the barrels are also standing unevenly. It is very natural and at the same time arouses the interest of the viewer. The crew figure set has been painted with acrylic paints. The uniforms have different shades, but they stick to the same color scheme.

Hello to all model enthusiasts and builders of static car models at 1/24 scale.

My name is Galotta Pasquale, I have been cultivating this passion since the tender age of ten, my first experiences were with my grandfather Pasquale who was a passionate boat builder, then gradually the passion moved towards automobiles.

I started modifying the metal diecasts, changing colors and modifying the interiors until I had a true collection as a true fan, then the aircrafts, the famous techniques with bricks, etc... etc...

In the last few years I have specialized in the use of various professional kits, refining construction and painting techniques by following many tutorials, I have built and wrecked various kits until reaching a good level of construction and attention to detail.

I have built plastic kits, following manufacturer guidelines and sometimes following my own idea, finding considerable appreciation in my work from other enthusiasts. Approximately two years ago I bought a resin kit from Alpha Model for the first time, the Mclaren 720s at 1/24 scale, facing this first experience on a completely new product to my knowledge.

I followed the manufacturer's construction guidelines and got a very well done job with attention to detail and paint thanks also to Streetblisters paints.

As is my custom, I post some build photos of the Mclaren 720s on my Instagram, FB page and share everything with the manufacturer Alpha Model, who at the time, knew them as a brand. In a short time I found myself in a world of attention and flattery that I was not prepared to have and handle. For me the construction of the Mclaren 720 was a standard procedure like any model, however it opened a world of opportunities and knowledge around the world among the various enthusiasts and producers of models and materials.

Some of these manufacturers have sponsored me for a long time and today they are my reference distributors in the gpmodeling.shop

I would like to tell you about the latest 1/24 scale resin kit of the Lamborghini STO sponsored by Alpha Model.

The kit looks like in the photo nº 1, already very clean and with a high detail of the details in both resin and metal. As usual, I start by engraving all the cut lines of the body, doors, hood, roof, etc.,

using a hook tool. The next phase is the preparation of the bodywork to receive the primer, smoothing with fine-grained sponges to remove the glossy patina from all the resin components and give the primer greater retention.

I proceed with a simple assembly of the main components to check that everything corresponds

according to the manual and also to understand the post-assembly procedure. After the first coat of primer, which can be spray or airbrushed, I let everything sit for 24 hours and then proceed with a light sanding always with fine grit sponges to remove imperfections and create greater color retention in the next stage.






I proceed to assemble them to complete the so-called cockpit/engine bathtub.

I proceed to the assembly and painting of the brake discs with carbon-ceramic effect paint and the calipers with

All of that led me to try this new style that I am involved with nowadays.

The truth is that at first it was very difficult for me to open my mind to this new style and unknown to me, nothing suited me and everything seemed chaotic, shadows where lights would go and vice versa? 3 or 4 shades layered on top of each other? my head and subconscious are mixed up with each other and they told me that this was not going to go well and that a big blur would come out of there, after many years accustomed to doing things in a different way than what modelers are used to, where they are the transitions between colors? straight lines and geometric shapes? After seeing a lot of

chapters, plates, photos of other artists, I jumped into the ring very cautiously and thinking about things 5 times before acting, I tried 2 figures from Juegettos, an articulated Goku and Bubu, I didn't like the joints and The paintings for my eyes accustomed to another style did not see it at all clear, so I tried to order a couple more of them from Aliexpress to spend as little money as possible to experience this new style, smudge, smudge and lose fear of it.

After several figures already painted in this anime style, I still keep thinking about things but now instead of 5 times I think about them only 2, although I still think that in the end it will happen to me as it happens to the

modelers that I will come to doing things automatically almost without thinking, little by little, many few will do a lot.

I think that the best thing in this style of painting is the less you think and you jump into the adventure without thinking about where this is going and where that is going, moving by intuitions and a bit of madness forgetting what they may think of your figure, at this point. of my life and after 25 years as a modeler in other categories, what I am looking for is fun and finish the painting session with a wet palette that does not have a millimeter without color, so as the other said ... who said fear when there are hospitals.







PAINTING THE BOOTS AND BELT:

I have used orange as a base paint and for the shadows to the orange I have added a few drops of matte red and chocolate brown. To go up the orange highlights I have been adding matte yellow, I continue adding flesh tones to lighten it more until I reach pure white, yes, yes you have read correctly the maximum highlights I always give them with pure white these are not historical figures and without any rigor, remember that we are looking for entertainment and white I can light with sky gray and as I already said for

assure you that once it is finished and giving it the AK ultramatt varnish they give it that plus, at least in my opinion, I will surely be confused, but remember after 25 years in this, I am looking for the little sanity and fun.

PAINTING THE PANTS:

Base color 80% neutral gray and 20% black. First neutral gray light alone, remember that we are looking for a great contrast between tones with big jumps.

Second light I give it with navy gray and a third

pure white maximum light, all with Vallejo.

PAINTING THE SHIRT:

Base color I have used pure black, we go up the lights with neutral gray and so on until we reach the sky gray superimposing the different tones, as a way of outlining the sky gray we give it white.

PAINTING THE JACKET:

Base color with Prussian blue, for the lights I mix a little Prussian blue with sky blue and we are looking for the shapes to the folds, I use black for the shadows.



SKIN PAINTING: Pink-brown base color PAINTING OF THE SWORD: Base color For the straps I have used medium blue as a with a drop of orange and a dash of chocolate brown, we continue with pink-brown only and mix golden meat to find the highlights, with toasted red we give some washing and with matt red wound marks.

I have used a toasted red paint with orange and a little chocolate brown tip, we marked the highlights with matt red, followed by vermilion red and finished with a fluorescent orange gouache.

base and raising lights mixing sky blue up to white as maximum light giving traces in the air, for the handle we start from chocolate brown and raise lights with meat, here I do not reach pure white.




