

NEW KITS COMING FROM TAMIYA!

Tamiya has some cool new, reworked and re-issued kits on the way, including a 100% new 1:35 Marder I tank-destroyer and 1:24 'Campus Friends' set

1:35 GERMAN TANK DESTROYER MARDER I (35370)

The Marder I was based upon the French Lorraine supply tractor. It was one of a number of commandeered vehicles pressed into German service. Around 170 were produced from May 1942 and

their 7.5cm Pak-40 anti-tank gun was a threat to Allied armour in the Battle of Normandy and also on the Eastern Front and even North Africa. Tamiya's designers worked up close with a specimen



in the Musée de Blindés at Saumur in France and the result is a highly accurate depiction of the compact chassis and overhanging armour, complete with rivet and weld line details.

KIT SPEC

- Interior features gun-breech detail, sighting gear, racks, radio equipment and more
- Link-and-length tracks have single-piece straight sections
- Two figures and three marking are options included, two from Normandy and one from the Eastern Front









1:24 CAMPUS FRIENDS SET 2 (24356)

1983 saw the release of the original 1:24
Campus Friends Set, a collection of five
figures and a scooter that was most useful
to modellers given the adaptability of the
figures to a range of accompanying models.
Now, Tamiya has brought that concept into
the modern day with newly-scanned figures,
paired with a range of accessories more
appropriate to the 2020s, with plenty of
options to choose from.

KIT SPEC

- Five figures are included: four female, one male, designed using 3D scanning techniques
- Natural poses include a figure taking a selfie
- Modern accessories include guitar case, coffee cup, smart phone and various bags







1:20 Fiat 131 Abarth Rally Olio Fiat (20069)

The real car was an Abarth-tuned version of the Fiat 131 Mirafiori with a 215hp two-litre engine; it was extremely lightweight thanks to extensive use of fibre-glass and aluminium across its body. It made a rally debut in 1976 and took titles in '77, '78



and '80. This is the first re-issue for the venerable Tamiya kit in twenty-one years and the first time with this new livery.

KIT SPEC

- Features a detailed replica of the two-litre engine, roll cageequipped interior, suspension and even the boot interior
- High quality Cartograf decals
- Comes with driver and co-driver figures

1:35 GERMAN TANK PANZERKAMPFWAGEN IV AUSF.F (35374)

The Pz.Kpfw.IV Ausf. F had reinforced armour and updated hull designs, as well as an L/24 75mm gun. Around 460 rolled off of the production lines, serving on the Eastern front as Nazi Germany grappled with the Soviet Union and in North Africa. In-depth research at the German Tank Museum in Munster contributed to this highly accurate kit, which features brand new parts across the board (only the lower hull and wheels are existing mouldings, seen in sand yellow plastic here).

KIT SPEC

- Link-and-length tracks capture the main Ausf.F design with lightened centre guide sections, assembly iig included
- Two types of engine deck hatch, with or without louvre
- Comes with commander, gunner and loader figures plus markings for two Eastern Front vehicles















1:24 LOTUS EUROPA SPECIAL (24358)

The Europa - manufactured between 1966 and 1972 - was a lightweight masterpiece of a sports car packed with features more likely seen on a racing car: a sleek, low body, mid-mounted engine and fibre-glass frame components. This is a welcome first re-issue in ten years for Tamiya's model of the Lotus Europa Special (previously Item 24212) and it includes a number of updates to the kit.

KIT SPEC

- The engine can be viewed after completion, with new air funnels
- New parts for a rear wing and RS Watanabe option wheels
- Features redesigned decals plus new photo-etched front grille, seatbelt stickers with Lotus logo, emblems and mirror surfaces as metal transfers





1:24 LOTUS SUPER 7 SERIES II (24357)

The Super 7 is a legendary kit-car that spawned legions of fans since its release in 1957 and it lives on today, manufactured by Caterham. Lotus developed and sold 'Seven' cars first, however, and the souped up Super 7 version of the car was powered by a four-cylinder, 1.3-litre Ford Cosworth engine, achieving a top speed of over 160km/h. Simple yet effective designs such as rack-and-pinion steering and drum-brakes made its assembly accessible to the home constructor.

KIT SPEC

- Features a realistic recreation of the Ford Cosworth engine under the opening bonnet
- Decals have been redesigned for this model, and also included are a new choice of seatbelt stickers.
- Choose whether to assemble as a road car, or a Clubman racer (with dedicated racing screens and roll bar)



1:72 Lockheed Martin F-35B Lightning II (60791)

This 1:72 scale model was manufactured by Italeri in 2019 and now joins the Tamiya 1:72 scale War Bird Series with the addition of Tamiya extras.

1:12 PORSCHE 935 MARTINI (12057)

This is a welcome - and updated re-issue of this classic model (previously Item 12038) of the Porsche 935 Martini, with new decals.

A FIRST LOOK AT ONE OF THE FEW

Eduard's new-tool 1:48 model of the Supermarine Spitfire Mk.I promised to be a landmark model of this iconic machine. The first, limited edition 'Spitfire Story: The Few' release arrived recently and we were keen to take a close-up look at the kit parts...

duard are known for their no-compromise, high-tech kits of classic warbirds and the Spitfire Mk.I has recently joined their line-up of Mustangs, Bf109s and Fw190s. This boxing comprises two whole Spitfire models, each provided with a full complement of decals, photo-etched brass and self-adhesive canopy masks.

Upon handling the fuselage parts, the first aspect that becomes apparent is the hundreds (thousands?) of minuscule raised rivets that cover the surfaces, rearwards from the cockpit area. They feel quite prominent to the touch and in the close-up photos with this review, they appear a little large. But in practice, once the model has been built, painted, decalled and weathered, the rivets become much less discernable and add a wonderful extra layer of detail to the model.


As always, there is a whole suite of add-ons on the way for this kit, but from this quick look at the 'basic' parts, it looks like it will built into a magnificent replica with nothing extra added. Full-build review coming to TMMI soon. ●





Jean-Claude Vancracynest builds the P204(f) armoured railway car in 1:35 from Tamiya, a cooperative project with ICM, complete with figurines and accessories



E LINE!

t the beginning of the 20th century with its vast colonial empire requiring an increased military presence for the maintenance of law and order, the French state requested the development of an armoured and armed vehicle for rapid reconnaissance.

It was the 'Panhard' firm which came up with the best solutions to the requested specifications. There would follow a whole series of vehicles based on civilian cars, militarised by the addition of thin armour and light weaponry. The studies would lead to the first wheeled armoured car, the Panhard 165, a vehicle of 6.75 tons, armed with a 37mm cannon and a 7.5mm machine gun.

This Panhard's great innovation was its rear driving position, which allowed the unit to withdraw quickly from combat zones. The vehicle underwent constant transformations, leading in 1932 to the AMD175 (Auto Mitrailleuse Découverte), deployed in all the French colonies. Several modifications were made to optimise its function as a reconnaissance vehicle: a 25mm anti-tank gun with significantly greater ballistic power than its predecessor, plus a new exhaust that made it much quieter. These improvements resulted in the AMD 35 version.

In May 1940, thanks to its great mobility and its weaponry, it would prove to be very effective in the face of the wave of panzers. The Germans were impressed too, recovering almost all the examples that fell into their hands and using them under the designation 'Panzerspähwagen P204(f)'.

Out of a total of 200 vehicles captured, forty were converted to this railway version and sent almost entirely to the Eastern Front to secure the rail network and to support armoured trains. We will find P204 (f) until the end of the conflict on German railways too. •





O OPEN THE DOORS!

This kit is a rework of the ICM model released in 2017. Tamiya added three sprues, two for figures and one for accessories and weaponry. The two figures - an engine commander and an over-coated infantryman - seem to be the 1:16 scale miniatures of the series reduced to 1:35, which bodes well for fine detail. The vehicle is a great success, in particular for the rendering of the omnipresent rivet lines on the hull and the turret. The AMD35 aka P204(f) features several types of rivets.

It's impossible to resign oneself to closing up the hull hatches, although having them open does not really ease the assembly as it will be necessary to plan the stages of painting and weathering of the interior fittings.



WHEELS TO IDENTIFY

Rail wheels are supplied in duplicate (for two P204s) as they are on the same sprue as the rails and sleepers and Tamiya provides more track length than in the original ICM kit. The assembly of the wheels is very simple but it is essential to identify them because each has its own location.

PAINTING THE PANHARD

I opted for a overall dark yellow livery which best highlights the rivets and edges of the vehicle. Tamiya offers us three markingsoptions, including one on a yellow base.


Creating the scenic display

The section of railway provided is very well done, with sleepers whose wood grain is remarkably well executed. I opted for a small-sized vignette to highlight the vehicle and the characters facing it. I let you discover the main stages of its realisation in the accompanying photos!

Tamiya once again offers us a kit box containing practically everything needed for a scenario of the vehicle. In addition, the subject matter is original and the ICM base kit is really high quality, so there's no reason not



FULL-BUILD: WORLD WAR TWO ALLIED AVIATION

EDUARD 1:48 GRUMMAN HELLGAT MK.I/MK.II DUAL COMBO O KIT NO.3223

he American Hellcat was selected to replace the Wildcat and from the end of 1944, the FAA Hellcat activity shifted to the Pacific. Along with the British Pacific fleet, combat operations in 1944-45 were centred in the vicinity of Malaysia, eastern India, Sumatra, supporting American landings on Okinawa, where Hellcat pilots engaged ground, sea and air assets of the enemy, most often protecting Allied shipping from Kamikaze attacks and denying enemy reconnaissance attempts.

WHAT OPTION TO BUILD?

The British aircraft carrier HMS Indomitable was engaged in Pacific operations in the Indian Ocean from July, 1944. On August 24, 1944, 'Operation Banquet' saw attacks on Palembag and vicinity, including local refineries. These actions saw the participation of Hellcat aircraft FN430, piloted by P/O Hannay and I chose to model this specific aircraft for this project.






crisp and sharp, with all the major panel lines represented. Rivets are present on some select areas. The plastic is relatively soft, which makes it pleasant and easy to work with. The clear parts are thin and free of distortion.

Even though the Eduard kit has good surface detail, I still felt I needed to add full riveting detail across the fuselage to better capture the look of the aircraft. Using scale drawings from several sources I was able to accurately position the rivet lines, using Dymo tape and a riveting tool. The addition of rivets also gives us a good foundation for weathering in the later project stages.

The Eduard cockpit is very well detailed and only needs careful painting, the only thing added being were Eduard photo-etch seat belts. Once the rivets were in place and the cockpit built up, the rest of the model was quickly assembled with no issues whatsoever. A real pleasure to build. Eduard also provides us with a very nice engine which was painted in Humbrol metallics and heavily weathered. Parts of the engine will be visible though the cowling opening so it is worthwhile to spend some time on detailing this part. •









The engine included in the kit is a very nice replica of the real thing. Not much will be seen after completion though. Still, it was painted in various metallics and weathered with oils for a nice well used effect

O PAINTING A WORN AND WEARY PACIFIC HELLCAT

I wanted to create a heavily weathered model, serving at sea in the Pacific and I was fortunate enough to find several colour photographs of Hellcats in FAA service in this region. I was struck by how heavily weathered and worn they looked, even though they served on an aircraft carrier deck. The camouflage colours were severely faded and varied and looked grimy and full of dirt spots and chipping.


The cockpit was painted in interior green, then given several washes of brown and black oil paint, followed by chipping with Humbrol metallics. I use raw/burnt umber oil paint for the dirty and dusty floor sections and black/sepia for the grimy walls and instrument panels. The Eduard metal seat belts were painted with brown oils to tone them down to match the muted colours in the cockpit.

THE MAIN PAINT JOB

The model was primed in a light grey Tamiya paint, which exposed some flaws that needed further sanding and polishing. This was fixed and further primer paint layers were put on. Pre-shading was then applied in several steps. First all panel lines and structural components were shaded with black paint. As a second step the open areas where heavily scribbled with black paint to create a marbled effect, which gives a perfect base for the worn and varied paint job to follow.

I then sprayed very thin layers of Mr Color 'Sky' colour on the lower surfaces, gradually building up the effect I was after. This time I overdid the pre-shading effect intentionally, to give a bit more dramatic effect, in line with what I saw in the colour photographs used as reference.

To capture a convincing look of the FAA camouflage colours I felt needed to do some extra research and effort. I struggled to find shades that I felt matched the photos and I experimented with different mixes of Gunze paint until I felt I had the right tones of grey and olive drab.



The dark grey was also mixed from Gunze

First, I gradually sprayed on very thin layers of the olive drab mix, making sure the pre-shading came through in a realistic way. The grey mix was then sprayed on freehand in a similar way. Once happy with the base paint job, I went back and carefully applied deeper shadows as well as highlights. I used the lighter colour tones to fade the paint on the upper areas around the engine and cockpit.

The whole model was given thin layers of Gunze clear and left to completely dry for about a week. The decals were then applied with small amounts of decal setting solution. The Eduard decals performed very well, and were a joy to put on. Once dry, an additional layer of Gunze Clear was sprayed on to protect the decals.

PACIFIC WEATHERING

Since the layering work with pre-shading and fading using the airbrush had

already created a fairly worn and weathered effect to the base paint job, the following steps were more about enhancing and reinforcing some of these effects. I find that this way of painting gives a more subtle effect to the final result, and I try to get as much done at the airbrush stage as possible.

As a first weathering step the decals needed to be integrated with the rest of the faded fuselage colours This was done by first sanding the decals carefully, which creates a worn and chipped effect and at the same time fades the colours a bit. After the sanding, the decals were sprayed very thin white paint in several layers, gradually building up the desired effect.

Once happy with the result, I went back with lighter tones of the basic paint layers and faded selected areas further. In order to build up an overall dirty effect on top of the

faded paint, all colours were then being unified with a few very thin filters using Sepia black-brown oil paint. Then thicker Sepia filters were added on top of the wings and selected panels to build up the multi-layered effect of faded and dirty paint.

For the areas around the wing roots and below the cockpit I used burnt umber and raw umber to add a lighter brownish dirty tone where dust and ground dirt would accumulate during operations. This brown colour-tone contrasted nicely with all that faded olive drab and grey, also giving a bit of warmth to overall finish of the model.

To add chipping and scratches to the fuselage I used acrylic colours and pencils in yellow, brown, black and grey shades. This takes quite some time; it is important to go slow and to keep the point of the pencil always sharp.

I also used faded sandy

colours from Vallejo to chip some areas with small sponges, creating further worn effects. Most of these chipping and mapping effects were then covered in brown filters to integrate and vary the impact of the chipped areas.


For some areas, Humbrol silver was applied using a small sponge to show bare metal through the paint, however this was kept to a minimum, careful not to

overdo it.

Then further dark brown oil paints were added in pin washes in all panel lines and rivet lines, trying to vary the application and not have the same tone in all panel lines. For select rivet lines I filled each rivet with dark Mig Productions pigments to give an even deeper effect. Several shades of MIG dust and earth coloured pigments were then placed across the surfaces to produce both colour variation but also subtle dust effects.



Once the base painting was finished, the kit was given several coats of Gunze Clear, after which the decals were applied, straight from the kit decal sheet. A bit on the thick side, but settled well after some effort



The propeller was primed in white. the painted yellow for the propeller tips. Masking was then applied and dark grey was sprayed as base colour before the weathering



A small sponge was used to carefully dab Humbrol silver pain onto the propeller, to show bright metal showing through. This was then toned down with additional brown oil washes

O FINAL DETAILS

The propeller was sprayed a very dark grey and then chipped with Humbrol metallics and a small sponge. Once this was dry, I then gave the propeller several filters of dark brown oil paint. The wheels were also sprayed dark grey and then given several layers of MiG Pigments in light colours.

CONCLUSION

This is a great kit. Details and fit are superb, and the result is a beautiful small replica of the Hellcat. I was happy to tackle the challenge of a weather-beaten Pacific FAA finish and was lucky to have access to the colour photos as reference − sometimes reality shows you things you would normally not dare to do! ●

Domenico Papaleo and Gennaro Zappa build 'the little grey mouse', Italeri's rather magnificent 1:12 FIAT 500F

he appearance of the Fiat 500 F model in 1968 would be accompanied by the introduction of various improvements in the mechanical aspects of the car: the differential, joints and the axle shafts were suitably reinforced and the brakes improved. The engine, another strong point of the car, was adequately 'pumped up' to deliver a maximum power of a whopping 18bhp to cope with the increase in weight of the car, which would further entail the optimization of other components such as a strengthened clutch, the larger air filter and the larger capacity fuel tank to cope with the inevitable increase in consumption.

500F IN 1:12

The engine kit looks spectacular from the box: Italeri has not overlooked any detail, faithfully reproducing meticulous components such as the Marelli distributor, the mechanical petrol-pump and the Weber 26 IMB 4 carburettor. But what really impresses is the accuracy with which some details have been reproduced, such as the surface detailing of the components.

The engine was painted with a Zero Paints Aluminium base colour, while the air-cooling system 'tinware' with Zero Paints Semi Gloss Black. Particular attention was paid to the painting of components such as the red-purple colour of the Marelli distributor, obtained by mixing Tamiya X-7 Red (gloss) and X-34

◆ Metallic Brown as well as the cap on the rocker cover where the original brass-plated effect was obtained by mixing colour X-12 Gold Leaf and X-31 Titanium Gold.

Details such as the exhaust manifolds, where the different shade of grey contrasts with the muffler pipes, were emphasised in a realistic way to highlight the difference in materials (cast iron for the exhaust manifold, steel for the muffler) and exposure to heat via the exhaust gases. Note also the gearbox was painted with different

shades of aluminium to accentuate the 'depth' of the ribs and in this casing.

The body parts, after a careful inspection and dry-assembly to check the fit, were treated with a few small touches of filler (Tamiya Putty), and then given a coat of Zero Paints White Primer to check for any imperfections of sanding. It should be noted that Italeri's designers have done a truly admirable job of the body and related parts: the bodywork of the model faithfully follows the lines of the real car without neglecting any details. **•**



As for the painting of the model, the intent was to reproduce the original colour of the Fiat 500 in my possession: defining the original colour code required a very careful and not at all obvious research because the Fiat 500F was reproduced in many different colours,

including two that are apparently very similar in shade, 'Antique Ivory' (Fiat colour code 234) and 'Sand Beige' (Fiat colour code 583). To better understand both of them, just think of that 'latte' colour!

This concludes the assembly of the small (but large) Fiat 500F, with a

warm memory of a beautiful experience shared with Gennaro Zappa and of an intense friendship thanks to model making, projecting us to the future and to our next planned project, which for the moment we will not reveal, but I let you imagine! ●

hilst this model has already been featured in TMMI (Issue 295, May 2020), I will not go over the excellent quality of the moulding and the details of this brand new Tamiya 1:35 kit: we covered this last time! There is no shortage of presentation possibilities and as the model is accompanied by a very nicely done figure of a tank commander, I chose to create a country setting to illustrate the theme of 'France 1940'.

Assembly is a walk in the park and only took me a few hours. I chose to break this kit down into several parts in order to make it easier to paint certain areas, such as the lower sides of the body, the tracks and more. As everything fitted together perfectly, I decided to finalise the assembly after the main painting phases. So much for the outline of the project, now let's see more details in pictures!



Part B7, which closes up the side of the turret. requires a little putty. The 'raw foundry' texture is very subtly represented. The small dome is moulded separately, so vou can orient it as vou wish



The different rubber components of the suspension (the rollers and the suspension tubes) were hand-painted dark grey, before tackling the sprockets. The area in contact with the tracks was covered with a layer of dark brown



Drybrushing was then carried out with AMMO by Mig Gun Metal, ideal for representing polished

After masking off the protective shield and the armoured cover with



The tracks were also painted Gun Metal. The paint adheres well and the metallic look is superb




To achieve the very complex camouflage, the author had the choice between the tedious cutting out of paper templates or the simpler use of Blu-tack. Strands of Blu-tack were placed directly on the model, then flattened according to the shapes of the camouflage



After airbrushing the first shade of the camouflage. new pieces of Blu-Tack were placed and the next colours applied. By the end, the model looked like a big ball of Blu-tack...



The camouflage is almost complete. For the colours, the author followed the recommendations in the instructions, except for the base layer for which the recommended XF-58 Olive Green was replaced with TS-61 NATO Green



French AFV camouflage of the time was often edged with a dark border. A thin brush from the Tamiya Pro II range was used to patiently outline each colour in matt black. With the camouflage on, the first steps of weathering could begin




Decal softener was used to help the waterslide transfers conform to the shapes of the kit. The markings of the 23rd BCC were chosen for their multitude of aces of tiles painted on the turret



To give the lower areas of the model a dusty look, a very diluted layer of XF-52 Flat Earth was applied. Then, using a Tamiya foam blender dipped in



The tracks were treated using the same method, then they were permanently installed on the running gear





After covering the entire model with a layer of mat varnish (24 hours drying time), an HB pencil was used to give the barrels and body edges a more authentic, metallic look



The base of the diorama was cut from cube of insulating foam. It was then covered with a thin layer of AMMO's 'Muddy Ground' acrylic paste to mimic the earthen groundwork







The two parts of the grass mat were simply attached by pressing them onto the acrylic paste which acts as a glue. The side of the bare embankment was also covered with AMMO acrylic mud





The surroundings were completed with Faller grass flocking plus tufts of grass from the brands 'Mininatur' and 'Joefix Studio'. The ground was then coloured with XF-52 Flat Earth with the addition here and there of a little XF-57 Buff



Once the earth colours were dry, some brown and dark brown washes were applied with an old brush



VHONEEDS DETAIL? VE NEED DETAIL!

Nathan LaPorte uses a small mountain of aftermarket accessories to bring Kinetic's 1:48 Grumman EA-6B Prowler to life

rowing up, I remember always building military jet models, even into my teens. Once I got into my early '20s I became fascinated with history and WWII and from there all I built was armour and aircraft from this period, pretty much forgetting about jets. Over the years though, there was always one jet that I wanted to build; the EA-6B Prowler. Something about that aircraft spoke to me, maybe because it is really quite odd-looking, or maybe it was thanks to Mike Ashley's Prowler on the cover of his iconic book 'Detailing Scale Model Aircraft' which was an essential

in improving mine and many others' modelling skills.

After seeing the Kinetic EA-6B Prowler kit in my local hobby store and doing some research online, I decided to purchase it and began what was a long journey of building the model you see here. Naval aircraft take a beating, especially planes from the late '70s to the '90s. Prowlers, just like F-14 Tomcats, were dirty birds. The sun, rain and salt all wreaked havoc on the surfaces of these machines. Often panels were discoloured and blotchy and there were also many repair paint jobs where paint repairs were hastily applied over chips

and scratches. I tried to simulate this worn look in my finish and used a few different techniques to achieve this.

Because it is my nature not to build a model out of the box, I began acquiring aftermarket items for the build. I knew right away that the kit needed an improved cockpit, especially considering the size and visibility of the Prowler's, so I acquired the Aires detail set. Upgraded resin parts from Wolfpack models for the landing gear bays, avionics, radar bay and wing-folds were also purchased. With these aftermarket sets I had enough to start my project.

CONSTRUCTION

Naturally, construction started with the cockpit and the Aires resin set is a true work of art. It was at this time I decided that the photo-etched seat harnesses included with the Aires kit were too much of a fiddle to make for the four different ejection seats, so I purchased Quickboost resin seats with the harnesses already cast in.


The cockpit was painted with Vallejo Model air paints and a dark colour-wash was used to bring out the surface detail. The ejection seats were first airbrushed Tamiya Semi-gloss black then carefully brush painted with regular Vallejo paints. Airscale Modern cockpit data plates and warning decals were used on the ejection seats for all the warning signs and data plates plastered all over them.

The seats, along with some other small parts, were left out until the cockpit was actually fitted in the airframe and exterior painting had finished to avoid breaking them with handling.

It was then time to focus on the landing gear and bays. The Wolfpack resin parts are very nicely detailed and match the kit parts perfectly, after carefully cutting out the kit original bays. I decided to add Eduard's photo-etched detail sets to further enhance the undercarriage, especially the landing gear doors. Moving to the landing gear itself, I decided to upgrade the kit parts as well. I found some very nice and much needed replacement resin wheels and tyres from Resikit.

One of the main disappointments of the kit was the intake and exhaust. The intakes comprise two parts with the compressor cone and fan being moulded into one of the sections. It would be impossible to paint the fan and mask it from the intake tunnel, so I carefully cut the around fan from the intake half. The inlet halves could then be assembled and painted without the fan section. The inlets still had a seam visible so a lot of time was spent filling the seams with Apoxie sculpt and sanding smooth.

The engine intakes comprise two mouldings with the compressor fan being moulded in with one of the major sections. It was impossible to paint the fan if left unmodified








Heavily diluted Tamiya XF-69 NATO Black was used for the pre-shading process, over a layer of Tamiya Grey Primer undercoat



To create a mottled, weathered texture on the airframe, various grain sizes of salt were sprinkled onto dampened upper surfaces of the aircraft, Highly diluted Model Air Light Ghost Grey was then sprayed with random intensity

The author chose Quickboost's resin seats which come with the harnesses already cast in, which looks more realistic than separate photo-etched harnesses




ALL TOGETHER NOW

Now was the time to bring all the aftermarket items together inside the fuselage. I had the front landing gear bay, the cockpit tub, the avionics tub and the front radar section to cram all in the same place. This proved to be an exercise in frustration. I sanded, checked the fit, and re-sanded the cockpit tub and avionic bay more times than I can remember until fuselage halves properly fitted together.

The Wolfpack wing-folds are a vast improvement over the kit parts as far as detail went, but it was difficult to figure out from the instructions what needed to be cut from the kit. In the end I needed to use a lot of filler and cleanup to make everything look good. When it came time to actually mount the folded wings I had to trim and sand the connection points for everything to fit properly.

I had to sand the cockpit tub until the floor got sanded through in a couple spots. Finally now that the fit was good I added the exhaust tubes and intake inlets to each fuselage half and glued the major interior components in place and was able to button up the two halves.

X-23 Clear Blue and X-25 Clear Green were mixed together to form the desired colour. The screen did not fit perfectly so putty was required in a few spots to fill some small gaps. With all the major components now finished all I had to do was add the little parts and minor sub-assemblies like the drop tanks, jamming pods, ladders, and the split canopies and photo-etched details. •



PAINTING AND WEATHERING

There is a vast array of great choices for EA-6B Prowlers as far as decals go. It was a tough choice but in the end I actually liked the VAQ-136 scheme that was offered with the kit. Searching online produced some pretty good pics of the real plane so I was ready to proceed to the finish line. Tamiya Grey Primer was a good base to start the paint process. After this was dry, I fired up the airbrush with some heavily diluted Tamiya XF-69 NATO Black to use as the pre-shading layer. After this, heavily diluted Tamiya flat white was then used and I airbrushed blotches randomly in the middle of the panels over the entire aircraft.

Model-Master Light Ghost Grey was used for the first colour coat. I airbrushed the paint in light thin coats so that the pre-shading and highlights was still slightly visible. After sufficient drying time, 'Panzer Putty' was used to mask the soft edge and the next upper surface colour was applied using Vallejo Model Air Dark Ghost Grey. Lastly, this was also masked-off then the last colour applied; Medium Grey, again from Model-Master.

FINAL DETAILS

Time to finish up the last bits that needed to be done before I could put a fork in this one! HGW remove-beforeflight tags were fitted after consulting my reference materials. These things are a real gem and super realistic for the scale. They are printed on both sides and hang naturally from the model, however they are a bit tricky to get a pin or wire through them so they can be attached. I lightly dusted them with pigments so they were not too shiny.

Last but certainly not least, the canopies come as halves that need to be glued together. I gave it careful thought as how to proceed with painting and gluing them. First I dipped the four parts in Future floor polish. After a couple days of drying I sprayed Alclad 2 Clear Yellow over the inner surfaces to recreate that gold tint the canopies on the Prowler have. This is an electronic protection coating for the cockpit from the ECM pods that the plane carries. After this had dried I applied a light coat of Tamiya X-19 Smoke to darken them slightly.

Montex masks were then used on the inside and outside of the canopy. The



inside canopy frames were airbrushed with Tamiya NATO Black and the outside Model-Master Medium Grey. After letting everything dry I took off the masks and glued the halves together. There is a control panel in the middle of both canopies in the form of a resin piece from Aires that was fixed at this time. Finally I added the photo-etched mirrors to both canopies. A little touch-up with Apoxie sculpt and the medium grey paint to the outside of the canopy where the two halves met and the seam is hardly noticeable.

FINAL THOUGHTS

This build was especially rewarding for me, as I finally got to build a Prowler to put in the display case. Building this model also brought me a sense of nostalgia of my younger days building jet models. Thankfully it turned out better than the models I used to build as a kid! It was also rewarding because of the difficulty of the project, partly of my own doing by adding so many aftermarket components inside the fuselage. The kit itself had its issues but overall is a very good representation of a Prowler. The weathered and worn look of the model also adds to the authenticity of what a Prowler really looked like in service.





The limitations of plastic moulding present real difficulties when kits need to represent extremely fine parts which in real life are made from metal strip. In many instances, etched brass comes to the rescue, but some shapes are notoriously difficult to represent. The protective guards on M4 Sherman tanks are a great example of this, and it is very difficult to get the correct shapes in scale thickness. MJ Miniatures have come to the rescue. The set contains four sets of the front and rear light guards, plus the horn (siren) guard, and two cable clamps. Supplied with the guards are the plug holders, which simply need to be glued to the side of the headlight guards. To say that these parts are incredible is barely sufficient: they are absolutely astonishing. **LIGHT GUARD SET FOR 1:35 SHERMAN TANK SERIES** (MJEZ35004)

It is common to see models where the figures have no slings (straps) on their weapons, but generally it would be normal for every rifle or submachine gun to have a sling fitted. Without such a strap, the soldier could not put the weapon over his shoulder and keep his hands free. Making straps in 1:35 is not at all easy, because they are fiddly and the real items had buckles and fittings that are hard to represent, until now. MI-Miniatures have released their first set of slings, specifically for the M1 Thompson, the M1 Garand and the M1918 BAR. The set consists of three straps for each weapon type, 3D printed side-on to get maximum detail. They are printed in a black material, and the detail on these items is simply staggering.

The Messerschmitt Bf108, nickname 'Taifun', might only be one number away from its much more famous brother, but it is a very different beast entirely. It was originally created to be a leisure aircraft but inevitably founds its way into the Luftwaffe's catalogue of military aircraft in the role of a liaison machine. It's a rather handsome machine and Eduard have listed a 1:48 kit of it in their catalogue for many years. Now, the company had released a new 1:32 model, apparently tooled originally by a different manufacturer but revitalised by Eduard. It comes with a very nice replica of the Argus inverted V8 engine although to actually see it, some plastic surgery will be required to open up the cowlings, which are moulded in with the fuselage. The 108's massive canopy reveals every bit of the cockpit and cabin, so there's a good amount of detail in here and the car-like seats are equipped with pre-painted harnesses. For the desert camouflaged option, much of the rear bench seat is swapped with fuel and oil drums for a more military-looking interior. A host of upgrade parts are on offer for this kit, as previewed in this issue's New



Releases Accessories.





Other variations will cover the roles of armoured transport, armoured ambulance, command post vehicle, reconnaissance vehicle, anti-tank missile carrier, air defence missile launcher, fire support vehicle and mortar carrier. (History edited from Wikipedia). Zvezda's kit comes on five substantial sprues of grey polystyrene, plus one in clear, the lower hull and two sprues of flexible, synthetic rubber for the tyres. The decal sheet carries a range of vehicle numbers plus the black/orange flashes for vehicles on parade. A small sheet of self-adhesive metallic stickers provides the rear-view mirrors. Zvezda's military kits are absolutely magnificent and this is no exception: the model comes with a fully detailed suspension (some modification will be needed to pose the front four wheels in the 'steered' position) plus a hull and top deck that are covered with fantastic raised and recessed detail. All that's needed is DEF Model's brilliant new



wheel/tyre set that replicates the weighted look of the real thing.





Forward Air Controllers during the Vietnam War acted as air-strike control for artillery, intelligence gathering and combat search and rescue, plus other missions, all dangerous. They were performed by various types of aircraft such as the Cessna O-1 Bird Dog, OV-10 Bronco and perhaps, most famously, the Cessna O-2A Skymaster. This oddly goodlooking machine featured in the 1988 film 'BAT 21' and makes an attractive subject for a kit. ICM recently launched this newtool 1:48 model fairly quietly - it's not a Messerschmitt or a Spitfire after all - but it's a significant release and, from a look at the parts, a very neat kit. It comes on just two sprues of mid-grey polystyrene with an extra in clear, plus a sheet of decals carrying four options: three USAF Vietnam Warperiod Skymasters in light grey/ white and one in overall flat black. Surface detail comprises extremely fine, recessed panel lines and fasteners where appropriate. Crucial for this aircraft is the large front canopy and it's comforting to see it is very thin and clear. The cockpit/cabin is remarkably full from front to back, with a full complement of radio gear provided for the rear of the interior space. This is a very welcome release and ICM have



done a lovely job of it.


















EDUARD, CZECH REPUBLIC WILDE SAU EPISODE ONE: RING OF FIRE

Eduard's 1:48 Bf109G-series kits are an absolute triumph of detail and refinement and have appeared in several forms already, with a range of modifications and markings. The latest to emerge from the Czech styrene-meisters is this 'dual-combo' set that provides no less than ten markingsoptions for aircraft of Oberst Hajo Hermann's 'Wilde Sau' (wild boar) night-fighter unit. The mission was devised to combat RAF Bomber Command's nighttime raids which used 'Window' (aluminium foil strips) to confuse German radar systems: the fighters would attack the bombers visually, using any source of light available. Eduard's plastic mouldings are stunning, with extremely fine, recessed rivets covering the airframe between panel lines and hatches. The cockpit is full of many very small parts resulting in beautiful replicas, so long as you have good eyes and tweezers. This is a ProfiPACK level kit, so you'll find a photo-etched instrument panel, harnesses and more (X2) for each kit, along with resin mainwheels and nightfighter exhaust-extenders. Naturally, you can use Eduard's own Brassin upgrade sets to take the detail even further, but these Bf109s will look just marvellous 'straight from the box'.



A right or lefthand-drive car can be built from the kit and parts such as the oval headlight trims (moulded individually), plus wheels, bumpers and other brightwork will be 'chrome' plated in the production kits. 

Building a base por a Gundam


or those who are not familiar with this universe, the Gundams are models of sci-fi robots directly from Japanese Anime TV programmes which have been all the rage for decades in Japan. I have chosen the 'Barbatos Lupus Rex' which appears in the 'Iron Blooded Orphans' series of 2015/2016 (this one was unfortunately not broadcast in my home country, France). In short, the story takes place in the distant future for control of the planet Mars. Combat units (giant robots) are piloted by young iconic daredevils who take on ever more incredible challenges to defend the values of a more just and equitable world!

HISTORY AND TECHNIQUE

Barbatos Lupus Rex is a veteran of the 'War of Calamities' which took place 300 years before the events of this series. Although obsolete. it is equipped with two Ahab energy reactors, which give it very high power. He has been regularly upgraded and his armour has been reinforced. He is specially equipped with a new system that sends data directly to his pilot Mikazuki Augus's brain via implants, allowing him to control this combat unit without needing to learn any commands or systems.

Of all the Gundam type combat units in the series. this robot is the most balance d in terms of versatility and performance. He is usually armed with a large energy discharge club. in addition to a sword directly connected to the energy generator. For those who want to know more. I recommend the site:



To create this setting, the author wanted to represent the interior of a hangar with different levels that would have been partly destroyed during the battles of the Gundam against its opponents. The base of the diorama and the pillar were cut from very dense, blue insulating-foam, the pipes being simple plastic straws. The platforms were made from plastic card and their supports reproduced with different Plastruct styrene profiles, the industrial beam type



The foam base was covered with a concrete effect wall-coating which proved to be perfect for reproducing the cement-look of the plinth. Two thin coats followed by light sanding were all it took to achieve this finish. At the same time, the plastic parts were primed in black



of sponge and a fine brush. The author also enhanced the edges


of some panels with a light grey line to give them more relief

To create the debris, the remaining section of the broken pillar was repurposed and small pieces of foam were covered with the concrete plaster. Some of the plater was spread over a piece of plastic bag and when dry, it was broken up to form the smallest pieces of rubble and dust



The largest pieces of debris were fixed on the diorama with epoxy glue. Then, the author added some cables from electronic components




Smaller fragments were finally scattered and then fixed using AK Interactive Sand and Gravel Fixer. This product was applied with a brush directly onto the debris. As it dries, it fixes them permanently without leaving any traces






Tamiya's new 1:35 R35 French Light Tank makes its second appearance in TMMI this issue and now, Eduard have created a photo-etched detail set for it. As it's for a new Tamiya model, there's not much that needs adding, but the parts on the fret will sharpen up some of the exterior fixtures and fittings, such as the fender braces, tool brackets, jack mount and exhaust box shield stays.



O IN MINIATURE

The 'Barbatos Lupus Rex' is part of the HG (High Grade = High Quality) range from the Japanese manufacturer Bandai which offers a large number of Gundam kits in different scales, from 1:144 to 1:20.

For our assembly, I have chosen a 1:144 scale model with a final size of around 15cm. The box features a beautiful space-fight scene and the sides of the box are covered with photos of the finished model in various fighting positions... Enough to inspire a modelling project!

When opening the box, I noticed that one of the four sprues is moulded in different colours (dark grey, red, blue and yellow). This is unusual for those like me who are more accustomed to uniform grey or khaki plastic, but above all it demonstrates the mastery of moulding achieved by the Japanese firm. This allows for coloured parts without the need for painting.

All of the parts are very finely detailed. The other highlight of this kit is that it is assembled without any glue, everything fitting together perfectly. And it remains posable thanks to the vinyl joints. Glue is not necessary and would only serve to permanently fix some parts that I thought were a little too loose.

As I mentioned above, this kit does not normally require painting, however I found it more practical to apply the weathering over a painted base. So I used the colours from the new Tamiya Lacquer Paint (LP) range which are tough enough for handling. To add a more personal touch, I decided to accentuate the ageing of the armour by adding a lot of surface wear and various traces of oxidation. In the end, you get a superb Gundam that you can position as you wish and let your imagination run free to create a futuristic scenario.




One of the sprues is moulded in several colours, demonstrating the expertise of Bandai in moulding. The parts are very finely detailed



General armour parts were undercoated with Tamiya Light Grey Primer before shading with flat black

The other coloured parts of the kit were treated with suitable gloss shades (LP-7, LP-8, LP-6)


The armour parts were scuffed up with Dark Rust (Vallejo) and a Tamiya extra fine brush



The author also used a piece of sponge dipped in Dark Rust paint to paint more random scratches. Just dip the end of the sponge in Dark Rust and remove the excess paint on a paper towel before patting the sponge on the kit



On the parts painted in black, the author chose to make the scratches in Chrome (X11)



To create dust effects on the model, it was sprayed with some very diluted JGSDF Brown, mainly on the feet and legs before creating Light Sand (LP-30) colour splashes with a toothbrush



Finally, pure Chrome (X-11) scratches were applied to mimic the metal shards from fighting
