





#### **O MODEL CONSTRUCTION**

The superb Tamiya kit, issued for first time in 1998, does not present major difficulties during assembly and still maintains an almost perfect fit nowadays, not being necessary to use putty in almost any of its joints lines, with the exception of the interior joint line of both parts of the fuselage, to ensure the continuity of the cockpit surfaces.



Some details were incorporated into the cockpit, mostly from Eduard's photo-etched set, stretched-sprue for the representation of cables, wound copper wire and 0.1 mm thick styrene

The cockpit in its finished painting stage. Vallejo acrylics were used with a brush to paint small details and washed with brown and grey oil paints in order to outline shapes and reliefs. The 'leather' effect was made with lightened reddish browns, applied with a sponge. Once the fuselage halves were glued together, the wings were assembled. The trailing edge was refined from the inside of each semi-circle to preserve surface details. The control surfaces of the stabilizers were cut to be placed in the 'active' position



The photo-etched seatbelts were worked with a Brussels-type clamp to achieve the characteristic irregularity of the real thing and then glued with cyanoacrylate prior to the painting process in order to ensure a proper adherence. The base colour (Tamiya XF-71) can be easily removed with a brush dipped in alcohol, so revealing the original colour of the pre-painted set

For the large instrument panel, Eduard's photo-etched offering with its corresponding film was used, which was completely repainted with brushed acrylics. Then it was washed with black oils to enhance the etched relief







The chosen subject features the standard three-colour camouflage characteristic of RAF fighter-bombers of the time. The painting process begins by painting the lower areas in Medium Sea Gray, for which Tamiya XF-83 was airbrushed. In order to distinguish the metal parts from the wooden ones, the former are painted with the colour slightly lightened with white (Tamiya XF-2).

The original decal sheet from the kit was used almost entirely for identification letters, serial and airframe stencils. Decals were placed using MicroSet for their correct location and MicroSol for their perfect adaptation to the surface. Before and after this process, Tamiya X-22 Clear varnish was applied. The roundels were painted and the corresponding masks were made using an Olfa circle cutter and a sheet of yellow Kabuki masking paper. •

#### MODEL WEATHERING

Based on photos of the real subject and similar ones from the same time frame, an attempt was made to reproduce the patterns of dirt and wear mainly with three techniques: dirtying certain areas with airbrush, watercolour pencils effects and oil paints. At all times, an attempt was made to achieve a balance between the effects, without exaggeration, in order to represent an aircraft used intensively but with a good level of maintenance.

Airbrush weathering was done with a very light mixture of Tamiya XF-1 and Tamiya X-9 diluted 95% or more with thinner, using a 0.2mm airbrush without cap and minimum working pressure. In this way, small lines and specks can be

made, concentrating on panels, lower areas and dirt accumulation.

The smoke from the exhausts was done in the same way, but mixing Tamiya XF-1 and Tamiya XF-9, with some light grey in the burned areas. The key in this process is the high dilution that allows almost transparent layers and control of the effect in a gradual, subtle way.

Oils were applied with two techniques mainly, dotted and in the form of colour-washes. The first was used with light colours on

As can be seen in this attempt, the edge of the wing roundel carrier film was quite visible, which is why it was decided to paint them after removing the decals. This could have been planned and carefully trimmed the transparent film to each decal






Due to the lack of panel lines characteristic of the Mosquito fuselage and lacking any other proper point of reference, carefully symmetrical thin strips of Tamiya tape were placed on each side to ensure perfect alignment of the lettering. The letters were individually cut out for placement, ensuring their contour and avoiding any possibility of silvering

#### Mini Review.

Tamiya's 1:35 M IO Tank Destroyer is a magnificent model of this American WW2 panzer-killer. It comes with a perfectly adequate moulded gun barrel but one thing it lacks is the rifling that's visible in the mouth of the muzzle. DEF Model's new barrel corrects with an aluminium gun tube and a photo-etched brass part (plus a spare) to depict the rifling. Just roll up the brass part and pop it inside the muzzle!









metallic surfaces close to the engines, to accentuate the wear of the paint on removable panels and with browns in the lower area of the tail to simulate accumulating dirt. Leak stains were accentuated a bit and more significant dirt was made in transit and maintenance areas with darker colours. After applying the dots, they were worked with a brush and white spirit until the desired shapes and intensity was achieved.

The 'veining' of the large wing surface is an effect that is produced by the passage of the wind at high speed. To achieve this effect, watercolour pencils were used. First the surface was moistened with a cotton cloth, then random lines are made in the direction of the wind, using with light colour pencils, mostly white, grey and cream, Finally, with a slightly moistened stiff bristle brush, the surface was worked while it dries, until the desired intensity is achieved. In case that doesn't work, you can easily lift the pigment with the moistened cotton cloth to start over

#### **O FINAL STEPS**

Colour-washes were used to highlight the articulation lines of moving surfaces, with a dark grey colour. Also, a lighter sand-coloured 'wash was applied to propeller blades, wheels, and pumps. After a drying period of more than twenty-four hours, the entire model was protected with XF-86 Flat Clear applied in thin layers, until the desired level of gloss is achieved. And there we have it, an iconic British aircraft that was designed and stationed in Hertfordshire! ●





## MONZA TRUCK

#### The superb new Alfa Romeo 8C 2300 Monza in 1:12 Italeri, by Lionel Albecker

he 8C 2300 race car was produced by Alfa Romeo between 1931 and 1934. It got its designation from its engine, a 2.3-litre, in-line eight cylinder unit. The suffix 'Monza' was added following its first victory on the Italian circuit in May 1931, in the hands of famous Italian driver Tazio Nuvolari. Intended for competition from its conception, it was also offered in a civilian version with more comfortable seats, mudguards and headlights, in order to be able to drive with a certain level of comfort (all relative for the time) and under all possible conditions.

188 examples were made (in three different series) in total. As was

common at the time, wealthy customers purchased the motorized chassis and then had it 'dressed' by the bodybuilder of their choice. So there were almost as many variations as there were clients, which makes it difficult to find documentation. The model reproduced by Italeri is an 8C 2300 of the first series, produced in 1932. The differences are mainly visible in the engine. Two versions are possible: civilian, plus the car that raced in Monaco in 1936 driven by Tazio Nuvolari. There are photos of this car on the internet on the Monaco circuit. This is it, sporting big race numbers

#### **O PRELIMINARIES**


The Italeri kit is completely new, not a Protar re-box, as was the case with the FIAT Mefistofele. We are dealing with a modern production and this shows through with finely reproduced details, some on a very precise photo-etched sheet, plus some of which will not be used for this build. Indeed, the outer radiator grille as well as the large 'Alfa Romeo' logo and the exhaust heat shield were not fitted to Nuvolari's car. We will also have the choice at the end of the assembly, to paint the race numbers using the masks provided, or to use decals.

On a project of this magnitude, the instructions should be carefully studied before gluing any part. You can then decide to change the order of assembly to make it easier or even identify the parts to be improved and think about how to do it.

#### **CHASSIS**

This is relatively simple to assemble, but it takes care a methodical approach to get it perfectly aligned. The two main spars and cross members were placed on a cutting mat graduated in 10mm increments to ensure that the side members were strictly parallel and the cross members perpendicular.

Once this 'dry' assembly was completed, I allowed Tamiya Extra Thin Liquid Cement to seep into the contact points by capillary action. After a good night of drying, the frame can be handled in complete safety. Next is the installation of the rear axle and front knuckles. Italeri supplies the suspension leaf packages moulded from a single block. The moulding line present on these parts must be removed. These packs of blades are fixed to the frame by means of micro-screws. I have found that applying a micro-drop of liquid glue to some screws helps them to tighten better, the fluid glue slightly softening the plastic. With this done, I sprayed a coat of grey primer all over the frame, followed by a coat of TS-8 Red, via an airbrush. After checking that all surfaces were well covered, I left it to dry for two days, so the paint would harden thoroughly.



Once assembled, the friction damper is installed on the axle, using the screws provided. A drop of Tamiva Extra Thin Liquid Cement can make fitting easier by slightly softening the plastic



Once all the components are fitted, a primer coat was applied before securing the rear axle to the frame



The part depicting the air filter is not very convincing, so the author substituted the photo-etched part with the addition of a piece of mesh: the mesh provided by Italeri was not used. On the real car, this part was very often dented and not necessarily hemispherical




The various cables and hoses were fixed with a drop of cyanoacrylate glue

#### **ENGINE**

Italeri has achieved the feat of reproducing the monstrous eight-cylinder in-line with double overhead camshaft and its compressor in great detail. We start with the assembly of the half-blocks and the coupled gearbox, without forgetting the gear lever, followed by the installation of the cylinder head and crankcase and the first ancillary elements. On the compressor is installed the first photo-cut part to be shaped by adapting it to part 46B. Having in my stock a piece of mesh finer than that of the kit, I preferred to use mine.

When assembling the (functional) steering box, I recommend putting a small drop of oil ('3 in 1' type) on the gears, avoiding soiling the bonding surfaces. The manual recommends fitting the hoses and cables during assembly of this unit. They are to be cut from the grey silicone tube or from the black vinyl tube provided. Once cut, I stuck a label (masking tape) with the identification letter of the instructions. This will help you find your way around. Once again, experience speaks for itself. •






To create more realistic rivet lines, the author removed and replaced them. A section of Tamiya masking tape allows you to locate the rivets in order to drill them without slipping



After pre-drilling of 0.3mm and 0.8mm holes, the rivets were inserted and fixed with cyano applied from the inside. Once dry, the rivet tails were cut flush. A drop of cyano was reapplied to ensure fixation



Due to the bad positioning of the front axle, the steering rods are too short by 3mm. The author lengthened them in the middle

The installation of the engine on the frame was done easily with fixing points identical to those of the real car. The assembled radiator, painted black and then drybrushed with a metallic tint can receive the race number. I used the masks provided by Italeri to paint the number on the grid. This done, the central part was masked off and the radiator surround painted in Alclad 2 Duralumin. For the steering system, there's a delicate operation on the tie-rod fixing rod. Its end should

screwdriver blade. It's an efficient process, but a little archaic all the same.

#### **CHECKERED FLAG**

The central part of the body around the passenger compartment was screwed to the frame. With a fine brush I applied a drop of LP-21 Red on each screw head, which is exactly the same as TS-8. Finally, the hood was simply recessed between the firewall and the grille, without the addition of glue - always with the aim of making it functional,



and the model was finished.

Not having made many 1:12 models I simply followed the Italeri instructions and overall, everything went very well. Certain points could still have been better handled by Italeri, in particular the fitting of the bonnet which ultimately seems a bit simplistic and presents some alignment issues. The functional steering is also more of a gimmick, to be used sparingly due to the relative flexibility

of the plastic that makes up the rods steel piano wire. This miniature will deserve pride of place in my collection. I don't regret the hundred hours I spent the FIAT 806 Grand Prix, and I intend soon, so that I can present the three cars

and links. If you really want to use it, I recommend replacing the idler rods with on it! I have since acquired the kit for to purchase the one for the Mefistofele side by side at my next exhibitions.

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## WHISTLING DEATH: BLACK SHEEP IN THE PTO


**Jason Hsiao** from Taiwan creates a fantastically atmospheric VMF-214 island airfield diorama using the Tamiya 1:32 F4U-1A Corsair

ecause of this impressive record, I wanted to pay tribute to this legendary history by making this diorama. The scale of the piece is 1:32 and I used Tamiva's F4U-1A (60325) kit for the main subject. The precision of this kit is very good overall and I only added details such as the engine's spark plug cables. In addition, I installed a micro motor and LED lights inside to make the aircraft 'operate'. In the spraying procedure, I used Mr.Metal Color No. 218 (Aluminium) as the base layer and referring to photos of the actual machine, I used a 0.2mm airbrush on the top of the oil cooler to cover the skin, the main maintenance holes and the movable hatches. I then sprayed Mr. Color No.351 (Interior Green) to form the zinc yellow primer. Major Boyington's aircraft No.883 sported a three-colour USN camouflage. From dark to light, I used Mr. Color C365 (Gloss Sea Blue), C366 (Intermediate Blue), and H316 (Insignia White) 80% mixed with C366 20% to dull the white slightly.

#### **BASIC COLOURS**

Before painting in blue tones, I applied Mr Hobby VM008 Mr. Silicone barrier using a cotton swab to the places where I want to show the 'paint-off' effect. This step is just like the familiar hairspray paint off method, except that the lacquer paint film is too strong. The silicone barrier was thus used as the 'paint-off' medium. After finishing the main colour painting, about one hour after the paint surface had dried, I used a hard-bristled brush to repeatedly rub at the predetermined paint-off positions. The shapes of the paint scrapes will change slightly according to the way the operator uses the brush. This step can create a very natural, but not too extreme paint effect. Next, I diluted some white oil paint and brushed it on the surface of the aircraft and wiping off the excess to demonstrate the effect of salt erosion in the air of the island.



The only details added to the engine were its ignition leads, plus a micro motor to allow the propeller to spin

Mr. Metal Color No.218 (Aluminium) was used as the base layer, then Mr.Color No.351 (Interior green) was airbrushed to suggest areas of yellow primer

#### **WEATHERING EFFECTS**

It can be seen from many photos that the skin, vertical tail, elevators and main fuel tank of the F4U-1 in service exhibited a lot of oil stains. I added these with AK Interactive's Aircraft Engine Oil Effects (AK2019) with a little bit of Tamiya's X-10 solvent to dilute it, to imitate natural patterns caused by the air flow. I also use AK's Streaking Grime Enamel Colour (AK012) to enhance further staining and create a richer sense of layering. Since the weathering process will reduce the colour saturation, I am used to using Holbein's heavy-body acrylic paint. After diluting with water, rendering methods were employed to increase the colour changes and saturation, so that the blue shades of this aeroplane would not be too badly affected by the weathering process and become a grey tone colour. I used a brush with soft pastel powders and drybrushed it on the tyres and the hatches close to the ground that would be contaminated to create a feeling of sand and dust.

I used smoke effect paint (MK-41) produced by Taiwan's MODO paint factory for the smoke effects from the engine exhaust and gun muzzles. Finally, I cemented the cockpit canopy on and then used a napkin with acrylic thickener to form a canvas covering the front windshield. I coloured this with acrylic paint. The antenna wire uses Infini Model 0.082mm aero black rigging (IR-4800B), with homemade details in copper wire to complete the antenna system.

The author used diluted white oil paint as a light-coloured wash over the airframe, to represent the unique weathering effects experienced at island airbases



Aircraft No.883 carried a three-colour US Navy camouflage. Mr.Color C365 Gloss Sea Blue, C366 Intermediate Blue and H316 Insignia White 80% plus C366 20% were used on the model



Before spraying the blue tones, the author had applied Mr Hobby VM008 Mr.Silicone barrier with a cotton swab to the places where the paint wear would be apparent. After finishing the main colour painting, about 1 hour after the paint surface is dry, a hard-bristled brush was used to rub off the paint in selected areas

#### **O** LANDSCAPE

In order to suggest the tropical climate of the Pacific Islands, I made two coconut palm trees, using 1mm wire as a support, then wrapping paper tape to make the trunk. After the leaves had been drawn by computer, the paper was cut with a laser cutter to create each leaf. Finally the coconuts were made from modelling clay.

For the terrain I used EK foam to stack up the embankment and I then fixed it on the wooden box. Then I brushed it with diluted white glue, pasted on wet kitchen paper towels, and poke the ground with a brush to create irregularities. White glue, acrylic paint and talcum powder were mixed to form a mud slurry, which was applied over the surface of the terrain. The static grass was laid before the slurry was dry. Finally, acrylic paint was used for colouring to make the overall tone natural and realistic.



Tamiya's 1:35 Willys Jeep MB kit (35219) was used for the diorama, it being quite close in scale to the Corsair. The jeep only took six hours to make!



Then I found a suitable 1:35 scale ammunition boxes and material from my inventory and placed them in the maintenance area around the aircraft. The USMC duck hunter camo rain cloth covering the material stack was also made from napkins. The jeep used is the Tamiya 1:35 Jeep Willys MB kit (35219). Because of the rush to participate in the model competition, it only took six hours to make, out-of-the-box, including painting. I think this kit is very good!

#### CONCLUSION

This diorama is 45cm in length and 60cm in width. It is the largest scene I have done so far. This size was necessary because I needed enough space to fit the big Corsair, Jeep and figures. I hope you will like the artistic conception of my work, and I hope to give more model makers some inspiration!


### Assembling Zvezda's M4A2 Sherman



The turret is completely smooth. To give it a rough, foundry look, the author dabbed some super-thin glue on its surface with an old brush. The glue softens the plastic and creates that grainy appearance typical of Sherman turrets







vezda has released an end-ofproduction M4A2 equipped with the turret armed with the 75mm gun. The A2 differed from the A1 and A3 versions by its diesel engine. Externally, they look a lot like other Shermans and only the engine range really sets it apart, especially thanks to the six filler caps used to fill the water, oil and fuel tanks. In terms of armament, the 75mm gun was supplemented by a .30 calibre coaxial turret machine gun and a hull machine gun of the same calibre. An M2 .50cal heavy machine gun was mounted on the commander cupola. The M4A2 was only used in Europe by the Red Army against Germany and in the Pacific by the Marines in their battles with the Japanese.

#### ZVEZDA'S ALL-NEW KIT

The Russian brand has been offering us excellent products for some time, of which this model is definitely one. The quality of the moulding is very high and the kit is full of small details, all very finely moulded, like the welds or the foundry numbers scattered over the body, bogies and turret. The hull is supplied in several parts: floor, side walls and front and rear armour.

In terms of the running gear, the box contains two complete sets of rollers (middle and end of production), as well as two sprocket designs (solid and perforated). The tracks are very true to reality and are supplied in the form of sections to which must be added nine separate links.

The upper section of the track has a very slight effect mimicking sagging at the return rollers. The upper hull, moulded in one piece, has beautiful detail, especially on the welds and all the hatches are formed separately, including the periscopes which can be rotated 360°. The turret is very true to life and only a very slight mould line on the right side needs to be sanded off.

The barrel is moulded in one piece and all you have to do is add the end of the tube, supplied separately and already drilled (as on the Tamiya kits of the M4 and M4A3). The roof machine gun is also very well detailed. A transparent sprue groups together the periscopes and the headlight optics. In terms of decals, four sets of markings are provided for two Soviet and two American vehicles. I was very pleasantly surprised by the Zvezda model. The fit of parts was perfect and the assembly was easy. Only the fitting of the tracks will prove to be a little too tight and on second thought, an extra link per side would not be too much. Here is a very pretty Sherman that I highly recommend if you want to add this very special version to your collection.

## Making the Sherman's sand bags

The author opted for the markings of M4A2 'Caesar' used by the US Marines in the Pacific. Many crews added additional protection to the tanks (wooden planks, corrugated iron, sandbags, etc.). To make the sandbags, the author used Tamiya Smooth Surface two-component epoxy putty which has the advantage of having a comfortable working-time compared to the Quick Type. Just mix the two components in equal parts and knead until you obtain a homogeneous blue/greenish paste. A small bead of putty 0.8cm in diameter was formed and cut out a piece of about 1cm. After several tries, the author was able to get a decent sandbag compared to the very first bag



To create a strip of bags, you don't have to sculpt them one by one. It is easier to install a strip of putty directly at the desired location, then to work the separations between the bags with a model cutter. For the size of the bags, the author was inspired by a photo. They are about 1cm high



A few folds were reproduced on the surface with a toothpick, or a large needle, or even a piece of stretched bunch. The author had not used gloves and fingerprints can be seen on some bags, which was subsequently corrected. Note the headlight and horn guards replaced by Eduard photo-etched elements



After a few hours a good result was achieved: perfectly realistic sandbags. Quick tip: don't hesitate to flatten the putty over the relief of the body to create a bag with a very slumped appearance. Be careful, however, not to break certain fragile parts such as those in photo-etch

The plastic cable in the box was replaced with braided metal wire, taken from a Dragon kit. By pressing the cable on still soft sandbags, it was fixed firmly in position and gives a very natural effect







The cable, machine gun and interior of the headlights were painted in various metallic colours. A light beige dry-brush was applied to the sandbags to bring out the folds




To reproduce the traces of fuel on the sidewalls, the author simply used Tamiya Panel Line Accent Color Black. The paint was applied with the applicator, then some runs and smudges were created with a super-fine brush. To give it a wet look, some runs were treated with a little gloss varnish



The author rubbed the lead of an HB pencil on the metal parts of the tools, the corners of the hull and where the crew worked the most, like here around the hatches

The American tanker figurine in summer clothes is an Alpine Miniatures item. Cast in resin, it has very fine details

### Making the diorama



The base of the diorama consists of a photo frame made of natural wood. The basic shapes of the groundwork were made with several lavers of 1cm thick foam board



After removing the layer of cardboard, the author reworked the contours with a cutter and sandpaper



The decor was enhanced by adding various small plants. Some are natural and were collected in the forest, others come from the trade (MK 1:35). The scene was completed with some plastic plants to decorate aquariums, repainted because their colours were too garish

### Fabricating a palm tree



To make the coconut tree, the author first cut the palm leaves out of a sheet of green paper folded like an accordion.



With a model knife, countless fronds were created. By stacking several sheets, one can work more quickly



To create jagged outlines, the edges of the coconut leaves were burnt. Be careful, the paper ignites very quickly!



The central rib was made with metal wire fixed with cyanoacrylate glue

This lovely little kit depicts a British aircraft carrier deck tractor that would have operated during the 1960s with the Royal Navy, so it is ideal to pair with Airfix's recently released Blackburn Buccaneer The kit is cast in medium-grey resin, supplemented with a sheet of photo-etched brass parts, decals and clear acetate for the dials. Fabulous!









To make the trunk, the author used a simple wooden branch...



...which was covered with adhesive paper



Then, nylon cord was wrapped irregularly around the trunk



Using patching plaster, the trunk was smoothed from the bottom up



For the top of the coconut tree, the author used a mini pine cone (2cm) picked up during a walk on the edge of a swamp (alder fruit according to a botanist friend of the author).



The leaves were painted, then fixed with wood glue by inserting the metal rods into the mini pine cone

The overwhelming majority of non-Formula 1 car kits are in 1:43, 1:24 and 1:25, but back in the late 1970s and early 1980s, Tamiya released a new kit on the market depicting the Fiat 131 Abarth Rally in 1:20. It was a bold move but sadly it didn't really catch on. The larger scale did, however, allow for more detail to be incorporated, in this case the inclusion of a lovely replica of the Fiat's two-litre, straight-four, DOHC engine, viewable after assembly thanks to the body shell's separately moulded bonnet. But the big bonus with this model is the inclusion of driver and co-driver figures, beautifully moulded in race suits with arms in action poses. This is the first re-issue for the '131 kit in over twenty years and the first time in this new livery, arguably not as attractive as the previous red/ green/white Alitalia (20013) and white/blue 1980 Monte Carlo schemes (20015), but welcome nonetheless. The box contains two sprues in black, one in white, one clear and one plated, plus the bodyshell (white), chassis/belly moulding (black), four synthetic rubber tyres, metal springs, vinyl tubing, polycaps, metal steering rod and axle pins, masking templates (not pre-cut) and waterslide decals. The model features a roll cage-equipped interior, workable suspension and boot interior. High quality Cartograf decals provide the finishing touch.



DG Flugzeugbau, the German manufacturer of the full-size subject,

is based in Bruschal, Germany, on the wonderfully-named Otto-Lilienthal Way. They have been making gliders for decades and the DG-1000S is their competition and aerobatics model. Miniatures of gliders might not be a common sight on the display tables at model shows, but they can make very attractive scale replicas nonetheless. This new release from Brengun depicts the DG1000S in 1:48, moulded on a single sprue of white polystyrene, plus an extra in clear for the two-part canopy. The slender fuselage is moulded conventionally in two halves, between which the twin cockpits are fitted, along with the housing for the nicely detailed landing leg and wheel. The wings are one-piece parts, moulded solidly because they are so thin that forming them in upper and lower halves was obviously unnecessary. It's hard to see in white plastic, but the wings feature aileron and airbrake detail (retracted) on their surfaces. The attachment tabs for the wings are very small and it will be a good idea to drill/ pin them through the fuselage, considering how much leverage will be placed upon them. Brengun have already created a photo-etched detail set for this model, providing deployed airbrakes, new instrument panels and more, and it will add some superb extra detail for this lovely little kit.





Between versions of their superb P-51D, Fw190, Bf109 and MiG-21 models, Eduard sometimes releases kits of offbeat subjects, usually Czech in origin and always full of character. This is certainly the case with their new Z-37A Čmelák (Czech: Bumblebee) in 1:72. The Zlin Z-37 is an agricultural aircraft which was manufactured in Czechoslovakia during the Cold War years: design work starting in 1961 with the first flight in March 1963. The Čmelák is powered by a Soviet-built lvchenko radial engine and is used mainly as a crop-duster, although many are now used for glider towing, having the ability to easily tow two gliders and often transport four gliders cross country. Eduard's kit, although diminutive, is packed with fantastic detail from the traces of stringers along the fuselage to the ribbing over the wings to the beautifully executed cockpit which includes photo-etched rudder pedals, seat harnesses and pre-painted instrument panel and consoles. in this initial, limited edition release, the kit box includes two whole kits, plus pre-coloured photo-etched parts, pre-cut canopy masks and even a resin pilot figure in a standing pose. No less than twelve markings options are included, nine of which are overall yellow aircraft, a mainly red machine plus two very attractive orange and white



examples.




# ITALERI, ITALY MERCEDES-BENZ 450SLC RALLYE BANDAMA 1979

and, as was often the case with this Italian maker, the model was ahead of its time in terms of detail and refinement. Esci were eventually incorporated within the Italeri brand and the latter sensibly released many Esci kits in the subsequent years, rebadged for the Italeri catalogue. The big Mercedes was one such release and it's great to see it resurface once again. The model depicts this five-litre beast as it appeared in the 11th Bandama Rally, Côte d'Ivoire, (Ivory Coast) in December 1979, the winning car being driven by Hannu Mikkola/Arne Hertz. The kit comes with a full set of night-stage spotlights for the grille, plus the huge single light by the co-driver's side window. The interior is appointed with a rollcage and racing seats for which decals harnesses are provided: an aftermarket set will look better. The model also features a decent replica of the 225bhp, 5-litre V8 engine and the modeller can chose to show it off by cutting through the narrow tabs that hold the bonnet in place. As we often state here, the key to success for a model car is its bodyshell, because if that looks wrong then nothing else really matters. Here, thankfully, we have an excellent

body moulding that captures the slab-sided lines of this big



it has arrived for review, we can see that the box includes some extra sprues for the M42 version, so it's an extensively redone production, based on the 1973 M40 75/18 model. 'A' sprue is one of the original 1970s mouldings and provides the suspension system, roadwheels, sprockets, idlers and return rollers. 'B' sprue is new and it carries a re-engineered gearbox (with 'SPA' logo) plus engine decking, track guards, hull side-panels and lower plate, plus sprocket tabs, jerrycans, driver's seat and other fittings. 'C' sprue is the second of the two 1973 mouldings in the box and the majority of parts are to be discarded, keeping just the fighting compartment structure and sadly, the main gun. The latter could have done with a makeover and will definitely need either the Aber (ABR35L117) or RB Models (35B103) replacement metal barrel to bring it up to spec. The small 'E' sprue is also a new tooling, carrying interior components such as ammunition rack, radio, battery, Breda 38 machine gun, three rounds of ammunition, redesigned engine compartment firewall, dashboard and other internal items.






















SCALE: 1:48 • MATERIALS: IM, WS • ITEM NO.K48067 The US-built MQ-9 Reaper is a high altitude, long range UAV (Unmanned Aerial Vehicle) currently in service with numerous

civilian and military agencies of the United States Government, along with the United Kingdom, Italy, Spain, France, Netherlands and Australia. The Reaper is a significant improvement on the earlier MQ-1 Predator with more than twice the speed and a higher maximum altitude of its predecessor. It can also carry 3,000lbs of weapons, including GBU Paveway and JDAM bombs, Sidewinder missiles and up to fourteen Hellfire missiles. The bloodline of Kinetic's 1:48 MQ-9 Reaper can be traced back to 2011 when it appeared in a Skunkmodels Workshop box, then again in 2012 as a Revell re-boxing with new markings and now as a Kinetic release with yet more new decals for a host of operators. The end-opening box (sad face) holds four sprues of grey polystyrene and one in clear for the wingtip formation lights and sensor-turret window. The decal sheet (printed to perfection by Cartograf) provides national insignia and numbers for no less than eight operators: Texas and New York Air National Guard, British Royal Air Force plus French, Italian, Netherlands, Spanish and Australian air forces. All airframes, regardless of the operator, are painted in FS 36375 Light Compass Ghost Gray on the upper surfaces and FS36176 Dark Gray on the lower surfaces, V-tail undersides and ventral tail fin.






in Afghanistan were conducted) is the latest BAE Systems upgrade of the British Army's FV510 Warrior AIFV (Armoured Infantry Fighting Vehicle). In this incarnation, the ageing Warrior was fitted with anti-RPG bararmour, better brakes, improved Environmental Control Unit, a driver's night-vision system and other weight-reducing and lifesaving enhancements. Meng's 1:35 model is newly issued and incorporates all the visible TES(H) upgrades, most notably the modular bar-armour system that wraps around the vehicle's hull. Very sensibly, Meng has chosen to depict these panels and framework with injectionmoulded parts and a super job they have done of it too. No doubt, there will be a photoetched set released that will tackle this with hundreds of strips of brass, but you can put your nervous breakdown on hold thanks to the standard kitplastic parts. There's no interior detail with this release but would you really want one, with all that additional armour too? Instead, we have a beautifully executed hull exterior that bristles with detail plus a set of brilliantly designed, articulated tracks that come with their own assembly jig. Some photo-etch takes care of the grilles and a brass main gun barrel provides the finishing touch. Wonderful.



















# **HAWKER TEMPEST MK.V**

Revell have released the Hawker Tempest Mk.V in the large scale of 1:32 - originally tooled by Czech manufacturer Special Hobby in 2016 - and it's an impressive boxful of plastic! Eight sprues of grey and one in clear polystyrene make up the parts, with just a sheet of waterslide decals as the only 'extra' in the box, which is interesting as it was first issued as a 'high tech' model that included resin and photo-etched parts. It was a wise decision by Revell to re-box it because, even without the original resin and PE parts, it is buzzing with rivet and panelline detail across the airframe, and it's also huge! It comes with a comprehensively detailed cockpit that builds up from side frames, front and rear bulkhead plus a 'floating' floor, typical of this aircraft. There are a lot of parts in here and, typical of a kit with short-run origins, the location points are a little vague or nonexistent, so the instructions will require extra attention and we would recommend the use of photo-references too. Revell have offered two markings options for this kit, both in the standard RAF Ocean Grey/ Dark Green upper surfaces with Medium Sea Grey undersurfaces

As a kid growing up in the mid to late '80s, Steve Dunn loved to visit his local model shop on Saturdays...

loved the completed models and dioramas on display in the window, and once inside the choice of model kits was mind boggling. On the lower tiers there were the small scale 1:72 kits; the bulk of the kits were displayed at head height and were mainly 1:35, but what really left an impression on my young self was the top tier out of reach (and out of price range) big 1:10 Tamiya radio controlled buggies.

Iconic names such as the Grasshopper, Hornet, Monster Beetle, Bigwig And Hotshot, just to name a few, looked so impressive with their amazing box art. I always wanted one but could never afford one. Luckily for me, Tamiya have re-released a number of these iconic models over the past few years. One such kit of that era to get re-released is the Fast Attack Vehicle (FAV), based on the US Army Special Forces buggy made by Chenowth. Here was an opportunity for me to make a childhood dream come true, and also transfer some of the painting techniques lots of us are familiar with from smaller 1:35 tanks and AFVs.

Just opening the box is a feast for the eyes! Everything is well packaged; the parts trees pack out most of the box, with the semi pneumatic tyres positioned in the top right corner. A separate small box contains the 540 motor, resin bumper, screw bags and gears. There is even a small tube of grease and a hex tool in there.

#### O DIAMOND DOGS DRIVER

I wanted to do something a little different from the box art, so I used the video game 'Metal Gear Solid V' for inspiration. One of the things you can do in that game is build up your own private army called 'Diamond Dogs' and despatch them on missions. With this in mind, I decided to portray this vehicle as belonging to Diamond Dogs. As a coincidence that game is set in the mid '80s, the perfect timeline for this buggy!

The first thing I needed to do was change the driver from US Army to DD private army. To achieve this I rather brutally cut

out the moulded plastic torso and replaced it with a resin bust of John Frost (from Arnhem Bridge fame) made by Mitches Military Models. After removing the moustache and cap badge I made a custom badge from lead foil. With a little more reworking and the addition of some after-market seat belts, he was ready for painting. I began the painting process with the driver, the flesh tones were painted in oils and then the uniform was given a base of Humbrol 237 & 72. Then followed the camouflage pattern, which was achieved with Humbrol 105 Marine Green, 62 Leather and 33 Black.

#### **BUGGY TIME!**

With the figure complete, I began work on the buggy. It was an absolute breeze to build thanks to the comprehensive instruction manual, therefore, it came together quickly. The only other additions where some sealed bearings to replace the plastic bushings in

the kit plus a 3D printed engine and .50cal machine gun for the roof, both made by Knight Customs. After fitting everything, I gave it a test run to make sure the radio gear was working, with that done it was partially stripped into sub-assemblies for painting.

Because I wanted to run this buggy

and not just have it as a static display model, I decided to base-coat it with a spray can rather than using an airbrush, so for this I used a can of Humbrol 237 Desert Tan spray. This was set aside to dry for twenty-four hours and then the MERDC camouflage was applied freehand with



ICM's recently released 1:32 Gloster Gladiator kit receives one of Yahu's amazing instrument panels with this set, massively upgrading the look of this focal point of the aircraft's cockpit. The panel is made from brass, with cut-outs for the dials which themselves feature clear lenses. There were a few bits of excess glue on our sample but they are easily removed.











the green and once dry, this was followed with 33 Matt Black and finally 34 Matt White. Once the customised decals were applied, I sprayed several thin coats of Humbrol Satin Varnish to protect the paintwork from the weathering process. This was set aside for a further twenty-four hours before I applied a filter using AMMO by Mig 1510. Once dry, I simulated chipped paint using a mix of Humbrol 67 and raw umber oil paint.

The initial chips were applied with a piece of sponge, followed by some more detailed chips and scratches using a fine paintbrush. Next I applied small dots of various colours of oil paint and with a flat brush moistened with white spirit, began to blend it in. When dry, this gives an impression of faded paint. After this, I painted some rust streaks using Humbrol 62 and burnt sienna oil paint and again, they were then blended using a flat brush moistened with white spirit. Washes of various dirt and rust colours were then applied.


For the final touches, I added fuel and oil spills to the engine area with dark brown and black paint; the rust on the exhaust was achieved by first applying Deluxe Materials Scenic Rust and then applying some rust coloured AMMO by Mig pigment. The dusty tyre effect was accomplished by applying sand coloured AMMO by Mig pigment with white spirit, and then once dry they were drybrushed using a mix of Humbrol 33 and 67 paints. •






# **Book Reviews**

**IMAGES OF WAR: THE AMERICANS ON D-DAY & IN NORMANDY** DAVID DOYLE, PEN & SWORD MILITARY www.pen-and-sword.co.uk

D-Day and the ensuing Battle of Normandy in the summer and autumn of 1944 must surely rate as one of the most frequently 'modelled' campaigns of the Second World War, arguably for the wide variety of hardware that was deployed to this sector, as well as being seen as a huge battle of good versus evil, when looked at on a grander scale. It also helps that tens of thousands of high quality photographs were taken in black and white (and colour), stimulating the imaginations of modellers and even model manufacturers. This recent title in Pen & Sword's 'Military' range of books brings together a generous quantity of the b/w images within its 250+ pages, with many being reproduced at large sizes throughout. From a scale modelling perspective, there are diorama ideas, uniform details and some interesting shots of vehicles. Overall, this title offers an excellent overview of














#### **ILLUSTRATED WEATHERING GUIDE WWII LATE WAR GERMAN VEHICLES** AMMO BY MIG JIMENEZ www.migjimenez.com

These days there is a plentiful supply of books that show the reader how to paint and weather a model of an AFV from start to finish, but to this reviewer's knowledge, this new title from AMMO by Mig Jimenez is the first to do the job using only colour illustrations, with barely a photo of a model in sight (just one at the back). The military artwork of Spanish artist Felipe Rodna has gained a huge amount of admiration, mainly through his work in the recent editions in the Panzerwrecks series of books and now, in this production, we see his creativity in all its glory. Each chapter starts with a sideview of the chosen vehicle in its basic colour on the righthand page: on the left page we have a description of what's going on and which paints, materials and equipment were used, all taken from the AMMO by Mig range, of course. Rodna's illustrations are stunning and very 'modeller friendly' and although seeming slightly unusual at first, this is actually a really novel way of showing how each paint and weathering step evolves.













# CLOSE CALL, RAF CLOSE AIR SUPPORT IN THE MEDITERRANEAN VOLUME I DEFEAT IN FRANCE TO EL HAMMA 1939-1943 VIC FLINTHAM, HIKOKI PUBLICATIONS www.crecy.co.uk

This is the first of two volumes that chronicle the establishment of 'close air support' within the Royal Air Force during the Second World War, covering the early years that begin with embryonic ground support missions in the latter part of the First World War, through to the failures during Operation Dynamo, the 1940 evacuation from Dunkirk. Volume one concludes with the Battle of El Hamma, Tunisia, 1943 having discussed in detail the operations around the Mediterranean that includes, perhaps most famously, Operation Torch. It is clear from the off that this is a hugely well researched production from author Vic Flintham and the result is a highly engaging read. From the scale modeller's point of view, there is plenty to enjoy here, not so much for the gathering of specific details on aircraft types (although the photographs are terrific), but more for gaining an insight into the tough Mediterranean campaign which rumbled on throughout the entirety of the war. Volume 2, to be published in April 2021 takes the story on from the assault on Sicily through a succession of battles in Italy and southern France.













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

The Lockheed P-38 Lightning is an iconic US fighter from the Second World War. Its twin Allison V12 engines were mounted in booms to free-up the nose so it could house a fearsome array of four M2 Browning machine guns and a 20mm cannon. The twinboom airframe became a sight feared by enemies wherever it served, with good reason.

In 2019, after several years of painstaking research, Tamiya released an all-new kit of this sleek aircraft and it has taken its place proudly in the 1:48 Aircraft Series as No.120 in the range.

In this new 'How To Build' book, Tamiya Model Magazine's Editor, Marcus Nicholls, presents no less than four built-up examples of Tamiya's fantastic model; one Lightning each from Brett Green and Spencer Pollard, plus two from Marcus Nicholls. The second of Marcus's models incorporates resin and photo-etched super-detail sets from Eduard, showing how they can be used within the build to take the detail to an even higher level. New photos of the other models show how Brett Green and Spencer Pollard built and painted the models in their own styles.

- Weathering the airframe
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


