

Ithough Tamiya already offer the M8 kit in the 1:35 Military Miniature Series (Items 35110, 35312), this kit features a totally new design based upon the intensive research of the actual M8 vehicle. With the HMC based upon the WW2 US M5 light tank chassis, the M8 featured an open-top turret and 75mm M3 howitzer. From September 1942 to early 1944, around 1,800 units were produced. M8s saw action in Italy, Western Europe and the Pacific, and supported US infantry until the end of the Second World War.

The Spitfire Mk.IXc was arguably the most important mark of Spitfire in the entire production run with it initially being conceived as a stop-gap fighter to counter the German Fw190 whilst the Mk.VIII was being developed. The Mk.IX is considered by many to be the ultimate Merlin powered Spitfire, coupling the iconic lines of the early Spitfires, which defended the skies above South East England just a couple of years earlier,

TAMIYA NEW AND FORTHCOMING ITEMS



This set includes the 1:48 Kawasaki Ki-61-Id Hien 'Tony' (61115) and 1:48 Japanese 4x4 Light Vehicle Type 95 'Kurogane' (32558) within a special package. The Hien was the only Japanese aircraft to be fitted with a liquid-cooled engine during WWII. Among a number of different variants produced, the Ki-61-Id featured a 20cm-elongated nose to house 20mm cannons plus 12.7mm wing machine guns. The 'Kurogane' was developed for the Japanese Army as the world's first lightweight 4x4 vehicle. From December 1937, after various improvements, a new type was produced that carried three passengers with a 33hp engine. The lightweight 4x4 Kurogane was used for reconnaissance and communication in China, South East Asia, and the Pacific. •



Tamiya 1:48 Messerschmitt Bf109 G-6 & Kübelwagen Type 82 Set

This 1:48 set provides the Messerschmitt Bf109 G-6 (61117) and the German Kübelwagen Type 82 (32501) in special packaging and painting guide. The Bf109 was the German Air Force's main aircraft during WWII and among its variants, the G-6 featured heavy armour with the dual 13mm gun (changed from dual 7.92mm guns) and 20mm cannon gondolas. The Kübelwagen Type 82 was developed based on the Volkswagen 'Beetle' and featured simple, lightweight structure with reliable air-cooled engine and four-wheel independent suspension. During WWII, this vehicle was in service for German forces. •

Tamiya has added three new materials to the Lacquer Paints line; LP-81 Mixing Blue, LP-82 Mixing Red and LP-83 Mixing Yellow. They are intended to be mixed in with other colours to adjust their hue. Other pigments are not utilised to ensure purity of colour. Using the mixing colours by themselves will result in a certain degree of transparency and may let plastic or paint colours beneath show through. Use with LP-10 Lacquer Thinner. •









Tamiya 1:24 NISSAN Fairlady Z (RZ34)

The Fairlady Z was announced for North America in August 2021 and for Japan in January 2022. The main theme of the 7th generation is "a fusion of tradition and the latest technology" by incorporating designs that pay homage to previous models of Nissan's belter. The engine is a high-performance three-litre V6 twin turbo that produces 405 horsepower. The power of the engine — mounted longitudinally at the front — is transmitted to the rear wheels via a six-speed MT or nine-speed AT transmission. In addition to the attractive form of a two-door fastback coupe it attracted the attention of sports car fans around the world as a pure petrol-engined machine without an electric motor.

On the way back is the 1:12 Lotus Type 78 with photo-etched details, originally released in this form in 2008 with the car kit itself dating back to 1977. It comes with updated decals and photo-etched parts that include brake discs, radiator, two designs of front and rear wingtips and seat buckles. •

M GET ITT

What happens when you take a superb plastic model kit and then embellish it with cutting edge details? **Spencer Pollard** seeks to answer that question as he builds Eduard's 1:48 Grumman Wildcat with all the bells and whistles...

ver my *cough* forty-five years of building models, certain kits, specific subjects or whole genres, have remain stubbornly absent from my repertoire. One of those subjects is Grumman's pugnacious Wildcat, a famous machine that should really feature in any collection of WWII aircraft. Given this rather shameful exclusion from my display cases, I was pleased when Marcus offered this kit up for review as now, a mere four decades after I should have looked at it, I had the chance to build one in miniature...

Eduard's kit has been around for a little while now, with a number of iterations hitting the shelves throughout 2022. The kit


that I was sent is part of their ProfiPACK range that includes a full set of plastic parts, an etched fret, a sheet of canopy masks and large decal sheet that covers 6 different machines in a variation of schemes and markings.

Open the box and you are faced with a very familiarlooking kit, the dark grev runners that are now de rigour in all Eduard models, sitting there waiting to be examined further. With the poly-bag opened and the runners sat on your desk you can marvel at the quality of the mouldings, the excellence of the delicate parts and the sheer volume of stunning surface details that decorate all of the airframe parts. You will also notice a surfeit of

parts, many of which are not appropriate to this particular F4F-3 variant. With an F4F-4 just released, a large number of details will either remain in the box or find their way into your spares box, but it's good to see them anyway. As a preparation for the build, I tend to remove all of these unwanted parts and place them in a small poly bag which I offer to you dear reader, as a worthwhile use of your initial time before construction begins proper.

As a kit, this one is actually fairly straightforward in its approach, seeming to be much like a 'curbside' car model where the kit only offers what can be seen and little more. Here, that manifests itself in offering the complete

airframe, with a detailed cockpit, enclosed engine and detailed gear bay and though there are separate control surfaces, these are designed to be - in the main - fixed in their neutral position. As a result of this approach, the number of parts in the kit is kept to a bare minimum and unwanted features left to the modeller, or Eduard's comprehensive collection of aftermarket products. For instance, the engine, including the cowling, is only seven parts, the cockpit fourteen and the gear bay, complex as it is, just under twenty. If you are building this kit as a 'Weekend' release, you will only have around 100 parts to deal with, which is remarkable given the complexity of the •

Eduard don't offer as many photo-etched sets for armoured vehicle models as they once did, but the latest three to arrive contain some useful parts that would look clumsy if moulded in polystyrene. This pack for the ex-ICM Sd.Kfz.247 includes dashboard and radio faces, along with some others neat fittings.

The engine was airbrushed with Tamiya Gloss Aluminium, washed with oils and then drybrushed with Citadel Stormhost Silver



The instrument panel is built up in layers, a plastic baseplate being embellished with delicate, photo-etched parts. Everything was glued together using AMMO's Ultraglue

The engine parts are painted, ready for assembly. Despite the simple steps taken to paint the engine, the detail has really popped and the pfft once all together, is very pleasing!



Though the smaller parts are noteworthy, perhaps the most impressive feature of this kit is once again the surface detail. This is complex, delicate and incredibly realistic, Eduard's designers offering recessed panel lines and rivets, as well as raised rivets, fasteners and hinges. Its all rather remarkable and a lot of fun to accentuate when the model is built, painted and decalled. That said, there are a few areas where

the panel lines and rivets drift off, no doubt as a result of the moulding process and the curvaceous lines of the full-sized aircraft. This is particularly so around the belly of the machine, as well as the upper surfaces of the cowling and just under the cockpit. This is not an insurmountable problem, jut one that feels noteworthy enough to mention here. Anyone willing to build this kit (especially in its ProfiPACK form) is likely to have the skills to deal with such issues, so I'll happily



The bulkhead that carries both the engine bearers and then the undercarriage is complex and at times, fiddly to assemble. Here is the completed structure, with everything bar the lower undercarriage legs in place. Care needs to be take to ensure that not only is everything assembled neatly, paintwork is carefully carried out and then protected as the individual parts are brought together



The cockpit is now in place. This was initially held inside the fuselage thanks to the rear bulkhead, Tamiya Extra Thin Cement being used to fix that part to the inner fuselage wall. Some fettling was then needed allow the fuselage halves to close neatly, especially around the instrument panel that has yet to



All of the internal parts are now in place. Given the small size of this model, there is a lot of parts inside that nose, all of which have to be carefully aligned. Care and no little patience is certainly needed before the day is done!



In order to save on masking, the area around the cockpit was

painted in the upper surface blue grey, this being mixed from Tamiya XF-18 Medium Blue, lightened with Flat White. Here is that colour in place, ready for the remaining fuselage panels and upper wings to be sprayed to match

mention it and move on...

With such a high level of detail, there comes a payoff of sorts in the form of complex, sometimes fiddly, subassemblies. This is particularly so inside the gear bay, where the Heath Robinson approach to dragging two wheels into a very confined space on the real aircraft, necessitates the construction of a large number of very delicate parts in miniature. In plastic this

is tricky, add in an extra layer of delicacy in the form of replacement brass and resin legs and you can will I am sure, begin to understand what I'm talking about! An early suggestion would be to spend time dry-fitting parts and then adjusting where needed. I found that this paid dividends when it came to using the brass legs that you see later on, as I needed to remove a small part of one of the braces to ensure it all

lined up. Similarly, one of the legs needed to have its upper struts shortened to make it fit, which came as something of a surprise, as the opposite leg dropped into place with no additional work! Answers on a postcard to...


DECALS: A NEW SYSTEM AND A MODELLER'S CONFUSION!

Recently-released Eduard kits have included decal sheets that reflect this new manufacturing process, my

Wildcat being no exception. From the off, you can see that there are changes; the colours are not as vibrant, the printing doesn't appear to be as sharp and the carrier film, previously found under the individual designs with tightly controlled edges, is now over each one, with varying amounts of excess material in evidence. They look different and in practice, they are applied differently, or in the case



Although I had a T-Face set to use for this build, I kept things simple and brought in to play the masking set supplied in the kit. You of course can pay your money and take your choice!



Here are the masked canopy parts. The kit offers a choice of windscreen and rear canopy, the latter offering open or closed structures



There are two small observation windows under the belly of the Wildcat that need to be fixed in place and masked prior to painting. Fit here is tight, so take care when gluing them in place





underlying colour, lightened with Mr. Hobby RLM65 Light Blue. This broke up the finish, helping to define surface details and structural features along the way



A close-up of that work with the airbrush shows how even with simple ideas such as those used here, a plain finish can become anything but! Note also the quality of the superb surface details, incised panels lines and rivets, working in harmony with raised rivets and hinges



The undersides were similarly treated, though this time work was carried out with a darker shade of grey to break up the panels and accentuate details

not lifting the film up, or damaging the marking. I was stumped. How did others remove this film when mine seemed to have steadfastly stayed in place? Was there a secret to all of this? Had I applied them incorrectly? Was each sheet slightly different..?

Whatever my issues were with the decals, I persevered and managed to create a model that though fully decorated, still left something to be desired, the colours of each marking looking to be washed out and slightly indistinct. As for that film, I managed to hide much of that with varnish. It was all a bit of a trial to be honest; maybe next time will be more successful!

As for choices, the kit offers to following six, the review kit being built in the colours and markings of Lt. Edward O'Hare.



In order to define the panel lines, a wash comprising AMMO's Starship Filth and Raw Umber oil paints both thinned with Odourless Thinner, was flowed into all panel lines and around raised detail



The whole model was treated with this wash and then allowed to stand for a few minutes to dry out (you can speed up the process with a hair dryer)



Then, using a makeup sponge dipped in Odourless Thinner, the excess wash was removed by dragging the sponge backwards along all surfaces




Here you can see how perfectly the panel lines are defined using this simple method of accentuation

The undercarriage is fiddly to construct, but looks very realistic in place. The legs and arms were painted with a mixture of pale grey and flat black, the polished oleo strut being replicated with chrome Bare Metal Foil



The completely painted engine is now in place. Having test-fitted the cowling over the top of this sub-assembly (which explains some green paint on the cylinders!) I was confident that I could now complete the model with all of the remaining details

3 is something to behold. Hopefully the accompanying images will give you a good idea of just how impressive these parts are and how you model will benefit from their use. Conclusion

Other than the issues with the decals, this was a superb kit to build and a really fun project to complete for my collection. Straight from the box the model would look great, but with the additional details that I used here, it became a real showstopper that showed off what was not only possible in last, but also what can be achieved using cutting edge technology and 3D printing.

I'm so pleased that I have now build this little fighter for my collection and may well build another when the later F4F-4 is released. Who knows, next time I might build a Royal Navy machine. Now wouldn't that be nice?!

BASIC PAVINTING



BASE COLOURS FIRST

I wanted to suggest the appearance of a relatively new tank (the Comet entered the war in the closing months of the Second World War) with a dark green tone and a simple dust build-up on the running gear and horizontal surfaces, so I applied a deep green made from Tamiya Olive Drab, 'cooled' in colour temperature by the addition of some Tamiya Clear Blue, which also imparted a nice sheen. "I'm off to a great start" I thought. Over this I liberally airbrushed a dust-coloured mixture of enamels, erroneously thinking it would only be a couple more days until I was finished. It looked awful, made worse by a somewhat desperate attempt to save

the day by the application of some colour-washes. I binned the idea of a dark green base colour and went back in with a lightened version of the green mix and sprayed it patchily over much of the green areas, leaving some of the dust effect to show through. This instantly transformed the look of the model and I could see daylight at the end of the tunnel again and not just the headlight of an approaching train. It now had a more traditional, almost 'Verlindeneque' look and I was quite happy with that.

New colour-washes were applied over the lighter green, followed by localised applications of pigments, more Humbrol and Revell enamel paint dust-mix

and finally, a going-over with AK Interactive's very handy Weathering Pencils. These can be sharpened to a point and applied directly to the model's surface, or

one can moisten the tip (!) and the colour applied with a small brush, allowing subtle streaks and staining to be created. I used both techniques on the Comet. •



Where to go from here? To create a more manageable green-tone, a lightened mixture of the initial green colour was airbrushed over the model in patches, keeping the finish irregular (done after this photo was taken)



A roughly 50/50 mixture of Humbrol 119 and Revell 89 enamel paints was made and thinned with white spirit

What not to do... In these images, the initial application of the enamel 'dust mix' and some subsequent colour-washes looked an absolute mess, with streaks, sticky patches, tide marks and other untidy effects in evidence. The moral of the story is to never give up, even when you think you've ruined the model. By working into the surface effects, one can refine and improve them until a satisfactory result is achieved



MAKING TRACKS

ШШШ

Tamiya's inclusion of link-and-length tracks moulded in the standard kit plastic instead of flexible, one-piece synthetic rubber items has greatly increased the realism of armour kits without the need for extra expenditure on aftermarket tracks sets by the modeller. There are two main of approaches to fitting them; they can be mounted during assembly - as suggested in the instructions - and airbrushed in situ, or painted and weathered while still on their sprues and fitted towards the end of the model's assembly. I took the latter approach with the M18 Hellcat from Tamiya, (published earlier this year and at the end of 2021 - another of my multi-part articles) and I did the same with the Comet. In my opinion this technique offers more a potentially more realistic result, because having full access to the inner track faces allows them to be painted and weathered without the roadwheels in the way.







O PAINTING THE FIGURES

The Comet is a handsome tank as it stands, but the installation of Tamiya's superb two-man crew will really bring it to life. I am not a particularly accomplished painter of figures, but it doesn't really matter if they are not given award-winning paint jobs, just so long as they are

there, they will give the model some real personality. I undercoated my pair with Tamiya LP Lacquer Paints to create the basic shades, followed by colour-washes and drybrushing to accentuate the moulded detail in the 'zoot' (later 'pixie') suits, with faces and details hand-painted using enamels and oil paints.

ACCESSORIES

I chose not to cover the model with the camouflage netting often seen in wartime photographs, simply because I wanted to show how the kit looks built 'from the box' and the net would have hidden all that. At model shows and online, I am sure we will soon see Tamiya's Comet built with this in place and it will look marvellous, no doubt. The only stowage items of note

that I added are the piece of cloth and wooden box on the left-side track-guard and there's a reason for their presence. During assembly, I managed to snap the track bar (part D58) clean in two, with one half of it entering low Earth-orbit, never to be seen again. Not wanting to make a new one, I cemented the remaining piece to the model and hid the missing end with the cloth, which I made from lead foil. The box

(Value Gear) is there to hold the cloth in place, visually. Ahem.

FINAL THOUGHTS

I loved every minute of this kit, even when I thought I had dug (weathered) myself into a hole during the initial paint stages. It could be argued that creating an engaging-looking model in a single-colour paint finish is more challenging than a camouflaged vehicle and

one could argue this point over and over. Personally, I enjoy that challenge and to re-iterate what I said at the start, having a couple of extra weeks on the model made all the difference to the outcome. I highly recommend this kit to beginners and experienced modellers alike; it's full of detail, smooth to build and with the crew fitted, looks terrific once complete. Just add a trumpet and you're all done!







Since the Erhardt M.1915 armoured car turned out to be somewhat more reliable than others, an order for twelve new combat vehicles was given. The main theatre of war for the Erhardt 1917 was Ukraine and the Southern regions of Russia.In Italy and on the Western front they were doing not much. It is worth mentioning, that at least two Ehrhardt (1915version and 1917) were captured by the Red Army and a third one by the Polish army" (www.copperstatemodels. com). Copper State Models have created a range of fabulous 1:35 kits depicting early armoured cars, including the Lanchester, Minerva, Romfell, Lancia, Russo-Balt and others. The models are absolutely stunning in detail and very precisely engineered, so when they announced they were developing a kit of the Ehrhardt Strassenwagen behemoth, it was an absolute must-have...We received a pre-production sample of this new kit and it looks fantastic from an inspection of the sprues. No engine is provided and interior is rudimentary, but that's just fine because all of the interest here lies on the outer surface and here, we are treated to some exceptional detail. The chassis and running gear are fully depicted and coupled with the extensively riveted body, it will be a dream to paint and weatherup. A photo-etched set will be released separately for the model (see photos) and there are likely to be other add-ons coming too. 



The T-34 is a tank that needs no introduction, and the 1943 version with the 'hexagonal' turret was the most widely produced

version with the 76mm gun. Indeed, these tanks were still widely seen at the end of the war, despite grievous losses on the battlefield. The 1943 version from Factory (Zavod) 183 had wheels with ribs and holes, making them very distinctive. Dragon kits of this tank are extremely high quality, and are very straightforward to build. Aside from the driver's hatch being very slightly (2mm) off the centre line, these kits are regarded as highly accurate and fully detailed. This particular boxing has several important features. The kit provided alternative turret roofs, so that the model can be made with the cupola or with two plain hatches. In addition, being a Smart Kit, the kit comes with superb individual track links which need nothing more than a light sand to remove moulding marks before assembly. The kit also includes etched parts for the rear engine mesh, plus sundry straps and fittings, all intended to improve the accuracy and detail of this excellent kit. As with most Dragon kits, the box contains a vast number of unused parts on sprues, and it is vital to keep a close eye on which parts to use, to avoid making errors. The resulting model is absolutely first-rate, with everything the modeller could ask for. Dragon

ICM. UKRAINE LAFFLY VI5T WITH HOTCHKISS MACHINE GUN

produced for the French army immediately before the outbreak of hostilities in WW2. The VI5T was produced in small numbers (100 examples from Laffly, another 100 from Corre La Licorne) and was specifically designed to tow the tiny Hotchkiss or APX 25mm SA anti-tank guns. The vehicle had stowage for the ammunition and the crew of 4 or 5 members. The VI5T was used after the armistice by the Vichy forces, and was extensively used by a grateful Wehrmacht, who appreciated this successful vehicle. This boxing of the ICM kit differs from the original release in the optional addition of a Hotchkiss machine gun (in two versions). This variant existed in at least one factory photo. The detail of the kit is very sharp and accurate, making a very impressive model. The handles on the stowage bins are moulded in place, but can easily be enhanced with careful painting, or else replaced with wire. The chassis is highly detailed and fully complete. The kit has some parts for a captured vehicle, and the first step in the instructions suggests removing the extended towing hook fitted to some vehicles captured by the Germans. The kit does not include the fifth seat which was fitted in the rear, facing forward - all of the seats required the occupant to sit



The Laffly was widely used by France and Germany, and is a great looking little truck.

The folded canvas hood and doors are represented very stiffly and could be replaced.


















The Panzer IV was the only German tank to be in production throughout WW2, and certainly rapidly became the mainstay of Panzer units, gradually up-armoured and given a better gun, this one tank was a feared adversary at all times. During the battles for North Africa, the Panzer IV was particularly feared when the 'long-barrel' versions appeared, and Allied tanks were always at a disadvantage. First released in 1974, the Italeri kit of this tank stands up well against newer kits, and this latest boxing shows no signs of age. The moulding is sharp and crisp, with good detail and no flash. The kit builds up into three possible versions, namely the FI with the short gun, the F2 with the longer gun, and the G with a double-baffle muzzle brake. The kit comes with very well detailed flexible one-piece tracks, which speeds up assembly considerably. Throughout assembly it is important to carefully study the instructions to make correct choices of optional parts for the selected version, as Italeri provide the appropriate parts for each version. The kit also provides nine figures and a range of accessories. Although the tank kit remains an excellent and easily assembled model, the figures are not quite so timeless, and need a little work to bring them up to the same standard. The kit decals are new, sharp and extremely thin, giving a range of options for the North African battles commemorated in this kit. CLS













n the early days of the Cold War the Admiralty issued a requirement for a low level nuclear armed bomber capable of 550 knots and a range of 400 miles, also capable of being stowed within the relatively small carrier decks. This meant that design was limited to specific sizes and weights. The result of the Blackburn submission to specification was NA.39 and by 1958 the

first aircraft left the ground. After development the Mk.1 entered service in 1963.

Engine upgrades from the Mk.1 to Spey engines marked the introduction of the S.2. All units had converted to the more powerful Spey engined Buccaneers by 1966. The last Buccaneer left Royal Navy service for the Royal Air Force in 1978 along with new built airframes

and retired navy birds. The swan song of the Buccaneer now S.2B left service in 1994 having served well in the first Gulf war of 1991.

CONTENTS

The strong, top-opening box with a fabulous artwork of a Buccaneer having just launched is surprisingly full. Total parts-count is 288 in a medium grey plastic which is some of the best I've

seen from this manufacturer. Panel lines are nicely recessed with rivets as divots where appropriate. Some strengthening plates are also on the surfaces and the detail is so much more restrained than some of Airfix recent offerings making this a league above the rest.



All of the parts for the cockpit in readiness for installation, most was a simple paint job covered with a decal. It then received a round of oil paint applied with a pin to represent the instructions

Everything you see is from the box and the details and breakdown of the cockpit means that there would be some difficulty in getting things wrongly placed. Instrument decals fitted well over the detail which could have easily been painted instead



As with the Vulcan a nose weight is needed and an enclosed capsule is provided, this later attached to the inside of one fuselage section and was nice and snug. I used Air rifle shot to make the weight

In order to get the familiar yellow and black ejector seat pull handles I painted yellow then went over them with a black permanent marker pen. This worked as a simple and swift solution



Clear parts offer alternative canopies and windscreens and this means that there could be one used whilst painting to protect the cockpit. A 36 page instruction manual is included which is in the new style of Airfix showing each part in the sequence displayed in position and highlighted after each step. Colour call-outs are of course to Humbrol being from the same stable as Airfix.

Two decal and markings sheets are included as is a separate stencil application guide. A single large decal sheet is well printed with good solid colours and plenty of room around each marking which aids cutting them out.

Markings are for four machines as follows; 1. XN981 S.2D No. 809 Naval Air Squadron, HMS Ark Royal, August 1978. 2. XV162 S.2C No. 801 Naval Air Squadron, HMS Hermes,

3. XV340 S.2C No. 809 Naval Air Squadron, Royal Naval Air Station Lossiemouth, Scotland, 1970.

4. XV867 S.2C No. 803 Naval Air Squadron, Royal Naval Air Station Lossiemouth, Scotland, 1969.

All are in overall Extra Dark Sea Grey with pale blue serials and squadron markings. Four complete weapons loads are options as are folded

open, a detailed cockpit is visible with the canopy open and with the ladders installed allows for a nice display option as does the engine blanks and exhaust covers, finally there is an option to have the port upper engine bay opened. So far this has to be the best Airfix kit I have ever seen!


Let's get into the build and see how we fare? An on line video of the designer of this kit is on an internet video hosting platform where some explanations are given into some of the idiosyncrasies of plastic injection moulding. Right from the outset decisions will need to be made as to the configuration and unit to match the decal options. Convenient half

deep holes are provided and just need to be drilled through. All of the detail is supplied in the instructions as to which holes to use for each version.

COCKPIT

Buccaneer cockpits always look cluttered and full of switches and gizmos. I have to commend the manufacturers as they have achieved a suitably busy cockpit. Individual instrument panels and side panels are provided all being clearly shown in the diagrams provided. Decals are provided for the dials but the rest is down to the modeller to paint.


I found that running a colour-wash around the




In swift time the nose section is closed and there was no need for any filler. I always seal joints after assembly with thin superglue to avoid any shrinkage later on


Gear bays and exhaust dropped in and there was plenty of alignment points to ensure correct fitment



Cast into the inside of the engine cover are depressions which can easily be used to chain drill out then cut the panel from the upper fuselage. I simply used a single sided razor blade to cut through then cleaned the edge up with files



Top and bottom Fuselages joined and the fit was very good. Airfix has provided a drop in section to cover the exposed engine during painting and its conveniently labelled as Mask





Wings were assembled and the folded sections dropped into the inner part. Wing tips are clear plastic and this means there is a natural seam on a real joint eliminating the issue of worrying abut attaching small tip lights

Outer folded wings slid onto he mounts and fitted with no fuss. Here too is the engine visible although I had a little issue with the attachment point for the top pipe



• details aided in my painting of each panel. Individual switches were picked out with oil paint applied with a small pin, the same was done to create some instructions and labelling around the cockpit. There is little in the way of colour in the cockpit and a little

artistic licence was used to colour some switches.

Being as this was the first chance to use the decals supplied they settled down over the details with some proprietary solutions and a little heat from a hair dryer. Further decisions are needed at the construction of the

commendable ejector seats and this is due to one in the back having splayed leg side guards to accommodate specific equipment.


Once each seat is built and painted then there is an option to use a decal for the seat belts. I went a slightly different route thinking they

would not represent the 3d feel adequately. I applied the decals to some Tamiya masking tape then cut them out and applied them using some Mig Ammo Ultra glue. With the visible overhead pull handles I painted vellow then simply ran a black marker over them to


<u>MINI REVIEW...</u>

As mentioned this issue, Eduard no longer offer as many etched sets for armoured vehicle models as they used to, but the latest to arrive contain some useful parts that would look a little too hefty if moulded in kit plastic. This set for the Italeri M109A2/A3/G provides some nice parts to sharpen up the kit's detail.














Holes are to be drilled for the correct areal fit for the particular aircraft you are building and once again Airfix has this covered by providing part recessed holes. Also the section for the open Port engine bay is clearly marked on the inside and after chain drilling the recessed holes I cut through with a razor blade.

The edge was cleaned up and the inner support part dropped in. In quick order the top fuselage was added and clamped up to rest overnight. I am pleased to say that everything fitted without any need to trim the bulkheads or any other part. I sealed all of the seams with a smear of thin superglue and then polished them back.

After painting the wingtip

Masking applied and ready for the paint. I went with a light coat of Mr Surfacer to check for any areas I had missed in preparation

folded and there are sections of the instructions to be skipped if you choose to extend them. A clever drop in section makes the wing angles setting easy as well as providing a strong joint. Up to the final assembly I left the outer wings loose and they could be left like that if you wanted.

Once more attention to detail has meant that options are available for the wings vortex generators which for the version I was building needed one removed from each run. This was simply achieved with a Micro Chisel. A light sanding cleaned up any small scratches. Unfortunately as a consequence of injection moulding there was some remnants of ejector pin marks on the inside off he ailerons and these needed

fit, this is not a difficult thing to deal with and within a few minutes they were removed and the parts joined. Wingtips are provided as a single clear part and this means that any joints which are on panel lines are disguised neatly. If displaying the wings unfolded then there are different inserts and a small tab to be removed.


One small item which has been well considered is that the Port upper engine panel which I built open, has a separate, drop-in part to act as a mask. This is clearly marked as such. At this stage the tail is built and there were no issues

Mating the tail to the mid fuselage did not present any issues although a little light sanding was done in order to get a smooth transition between the two. No filler was needed. A similar situation happened with he nose and in order to get things lined up I started with the top seam and set that first. Then when I looked at the bottom one it appeared to be slightly out, no need to worry as some light clamping bought the parts in alignment.

Once glued I left the model overnight to set, as previously I used a weld action glue reinforced by superglue. I had been a little concerned that the intake lips and exhaust were going to be troublesome but quite the contrary they dropped into place with no fuss, a smear of Mr surfacer and they were blended in. For

Small areas and peripheral details are now added as are the windscreen and canopy. I went with the screen without wiper as when I masked it up there was some really awkward corners which meant that the wiper got in the way a little. With the modern Airfix kits there has been considerable thought that has gone into the positioning of various items and the

refuelling probe was no exception. Here there is a recess which the probe drops into and providing you use a weld action glue this almost sets itself into position remembering that it is offset to starboard at an angle.

WEAPONS

A choice of weapons is provided with the version I was building needing Martel were probably the weakest part of the model as the fit wasn't too bad apart from the drop in fin sections. These left slight seams and they were difficult to access and clean up. I managed

cleaned up with cotton buds soaked with alcohol.

Care will need to be taken when adding the clear noses and the holes for the pin was a little tight. Alternatives are available as Matra Rockets, Slipper tanks or 1000Lb bombs. All appropriate pylons are provided and some are handed so just make sure the correct is used where appropriate. Final parts to add were the ladders and intake and engine covers. I chose to only add one for visual interest and to demonstrate what is in the model. Those outer wing panels were left off until after painting. •

the lower fuselage and into that goes a clear part for the anti collision beacon on the belly. The way this is made means there is no way to get it wrong. At this stage there are options to have the bomb bay open or closed. As I was going to use a heavy external load I chose to close the bay and this needed just the slightest sanding at the rear end to be a drop in fit. If the bay is displayed open, then there are several parts which add interest and detail, similarly the wheel bays have pipes added at this juncture and they were in need of a little fiddling and feeding up and over a bulkhead to fit. Once more the instructions show these parts clearly just study before committing to glue.

CONCLUSIONS

Well, this has to be one of the best Airfix kits I have ever had the chance to build and over the years there have been quite a few. Detail is good throughout and there was nothing I could find to catch modellers out. Several clever ideas have been used to aid the fitment and placement of parts. I cannot remember the last time that I was able to say I thoroughly enjoyed this model from start to finish and it was complete within a couple of weeks.

I had an issue with the decal bands for the weapons not being long enough but within the kit there were enough to cut and fill the gaps. This is not aimed at the first time modeller and the price reflects this as the detail included elevates this above the pocket money kit. I cannot wait for the inevitable RAF versions of the Brick to appear although I have a couple of the 1:72 kits in my stash to build, perhaps I ought to have a go at one of those as there will inevitably be similarities.

I can only hope that this is the way forward for this company and if their products remain at this level they will no doubt sell loads of this kit. I have the original 1:48 kit in my stash and the difference between that and this is a million miles apart. May Airfix go from strength to strength. Well done Airfix and the individual designer Paramjit for his efforts.





Book Reviews

The Dodge WC54 is the iconic American field ambulance for most of WW2 and into the Korean conflict. This vehicle, with a decent off-road capability, was to be found close to the front-line, picking up casualties from Aid Posts and Dressing Stations, and ferrying the wounded to field hospitals. On airfields, the WC54 would collect injured aircrew from the plane, and drive to medical facilities. The vehicle could accommodate four stretchers or seven sitting patients, and had a crew of two. This book by Fabien Raud provides a lot of intricate detail of fittings, helpful to anyone restoring an ambulance, and a good part of the book is beyond what any typical modeller could use. However, there are many pictures of the ambulances in

operation, and many snippets of information would provide that last piece of superdetail that brings up the standard of a model. This is a hardback book with over 150 pages jammed full of information, and the photos are very useful. The book does not cover in

detail the changes in external appearance, such as the petrol filler and the shape of the front grille, and modellers will

need to refer to photos of particular vehicles. Overall, a very valuable book for research and for making a very detailed model. CLS
