

THE EDITOR PAYS A VISIT TO THE BRITISH FACTORY WHERE AIRFIX'S NEWEST 1:24 CREATION COMES TO LIFE...

id you hear that Airfix has released an all-new 1:24 kit of the Spitfire Mk.IXc? If you haven't, you must have been living on Mars for the last few months! This spectacular new model joins the iconic Spitfire Mk.Ia in their 1:24 range which, staggeringly, is now fifty-two years old! The Mk.IXc is many technological generations newer of course, created with digital design software and laser-scanners along with good old cameras, tape measures, sketches and notes.

One factor with the new Spitfire kit is that it's proudly moulded and boxed in the UK, specifically at 'Plastech' in East Sussex and it was here that Airfix chose to present the model to the assembled magazine people, YouTubers, Vloggers, enthusiasts and TMMI, of course! We were given a tour of the facility and allowed to watch (and smell!) the hot plastic being injected into the steel moulds, all a rather heady experience and one that I found completely fascinating. We will be bringing you a detail build-up of this kit soon in TMMI, but for now, here are a few images from that day; one that I enjoyed immensely! •



tradition, now in its seventh generation he Fairlady Z was announced for North America in August 2021 and for Japan in January 2022: sadly there are no plans to import it officially to the UK though. This seventh generation car is, to quote Nissan, a "fusion of tradition and the latest technology". By this, they mean it pays homage to previous models of Nissan's rocket-ship but employs twentieth-century tech to propel the car at improbable speeds whilst cornering like it's on rails. The Z's engine is a 405 horsepower, three-litre, twin-turbo V6, mounted longitudinally at the front with power transmitted to the rear wheels via a six-speed MT or nine-speed AT transmission. This powertrain offers a neck-straining 0-60mph time of 4.3 seconds which is up there with the latest supercars costing three and four times as much.

# Z IN 1:24

Tamiya have also used some smart design to create the new 1:24 model, splitting hard-to-mask areas like exterior trim and the seats into individual, easy to paint parts that are brought

together to create a very neat finish. In US parlance, it's a 'curbside' kit, ie: no full engine and sealed bonnet, although a gearbox plus a highly detailed suspension and exhausted system provide more than enough to satisfy the eye when the model is inverted. As well as a lefthand-drive moulding, a righthand-drive dashboard, pedal locations and windscreen wipers are also supplied, not for a UK car, but for Japan, who drive on the left too.

There's some really smart design on show here, all done to make the kit more pleasurable to build by eliminating much of the need for bodyshell masking, rather like the McLaren Senna. It's a stunning production and while you won't see many on UK roads, it's a cool addition to Nissan's line-up of street machines.

# **ARDENNES COWBOYS:**

# THE THIRD ARMOURED DIVISION IN THE ARDENNES 1944

Ugo Giberti and Costantino Sanna team up to create an atmospheric Battle
of the Bulge diorama
featuring Tamiya's 1:35 M8
Greyhound and Jeep kits





he diorama started with two photos found on a Facebook page dedicated to veterans and episodes of the Battle of the Ardennes. The first - very rare portrays a snowplough Jeep on the road that leads from Bastogne to Cobreville, which is about seventeen kilometres away. The second portrays a GI holding a calf on a farm in Harlage, Luxembourg, both taken in January 1945. Around these two images, as if we had a wide-angle lens, we designed a more articulated scene, ie; an American unit with a Jeep and Greyhound armoured car that ventures along the secondary roads towards Cobreville and comes across a farm, where the American soldiers fraternise with the farmer, indulging in gestures of friendship and confidence. At this point it was a question of giving a more precise location to this frame; we therefore assumed that the scouting unit belonged to the 3rd American Armored Division which, with others, operated precisely in that sector of the Western Front and participated in the bloody clashes of this epic battle also known as 'Hitler's last stand' or the operation 'Watch am Rhein' (Watch On The Rhein).

The Ardennes offensive was very ambitious plan of Adolf Hitler, who even hoped for a major Allied defeat and a repetition of the Anglo-French defeat at Dunkirk. Despite the great Allied superiority in men and equipment (the German army still fielded 164 divisions on the eastern front and only seventy-four divisions on the west), during the first week the German forces achieved some significant victories and managed to break through deep into Allied lines.

Totally surprised, the Allied commanders and the troops in the field, susceptible to an excessive feeling of superiority and security, initially showed signs of failure and disbandment, leading to fears of a strategic disaster. The battle ended, after a month of clashes, with the final victory of the Allies and the failure of the German offensive, but the heavy losses suffered in the Ardennes, above all by the US army, forced a revision of the deployments and plans, slowed down the attack on the heart of Germany and also provoked a crisis in the supreme command between Marshal Bernard Law Montgomery and the US generals.

Indirectly, however, due to the use by the Germans of considerable reserves of men and armoured vehicles, this battle also facilitated the success of the overwhelming mass offensive of the Red Army on the Eastern Front which began on January 12th, 1945. The 3rd Armored Division fought in the far north of the deepest German penetration during the Battle of the Bulge. The division fought its way

• south in an attack designed to help sweep away so-called the 'Bulge' and bring the First Army into line with General George S. Patton's Third Army, which was fighting north towards Houffalize. The division cut off the road leading to St Vith and then reached Lierneux, Belgium, where it stopped to rest and regroup. After a month, the division resumed its offensive to the east and on 26th February it returned to Germany. Over the following weeks, the division crossed the Ruhr River and captured several cities, crossed the Erft and finally crossed the Rhine River to capture Cologne on 7 March. The division's last major combat of the war was the Battle of Dessau, which the division captured on 23rd April 1945 after three days of fighting.

## THE IDEA

It was therefore a question of creating a scenario that held this idea together in a coherent and convincing way: we therefore thought of a farm as a backdrop, located on a secondary country road, a downhill terrain, with melting snow and muddy ground. A trough for the cattle and spaces that could accommodate the American infantrymen and the two vehicles – the snowplough jeep and the Greyhound would be needed, but above all that would also allow the figurine with the calf in his arms, the other central subject for our story.

After having collected dozens of photos of the Battle of the Ardennes in order to accurately reproduce the terrain, vehicles and figures, we focused our attention on the building to be reproduced. At first we were oriented towards the portion of the house produced by Scale 75 with three American soldiers, then thanks to the collaboration of Gianni Sorrentino, using that idea, he reproduced a much more characterful house with an abundance of detail. This helped to add originality and completeness, since the house is the 'backdrop" necessary to

give substance to the imagined scene, indeed becoming an active part of it and not just a 'side dish'.

# THE WINTERY SCENERY

The farm, reproduced down to the smallest detail, was painted with acrylics and, with selective colour-washes, the damp-look was reproduced to differentiate the shades of the walls and the cracks with different greys, beiges and ochres. The gutter is a suitably cut and painted plastic tube. Also in this case we made use of specific products, including 'Slimy Grime Dark' of Vallejo (73822) to reproduce the rotten green due to damp at the base of the construction. It was with some regret that I had to cover a large part of the roof with AK's 'Snow Effect' paste (pics 1, 2). We were missing something, and hence the idea of placing a simple trough next to the two subjects, again after reviewing several reference photos (pics 3, 4).

# THE TERRAIN: BETWEEN MUD AND SNOW

After having created the sloping groundwork with shaped polystyrene and having made several dry tests for where and how to place vehicles and figures, everything was covered with the AK Interactive 'Wet Ground' (AK8016) mixed with real soil and various synthetic herbs of various colours (pics 5, 6, 7). Obviously this procedure was not applied to the two small roads travelled on by the vehicles which are extremely muddy, full of puddles and devoid of vegetation (pics 8, 9, 10). It was then necessary to establish the position of the American infantryman with the calf in his arms and whether to make him relate to another character: we therefore thought of this young soldier - a cowboy in times of peace - helping the farmer and, in a gesture of calm consideration, take the calf in his arms with affection and nostalgia.

At this point the difficult work of reproducing the melting snow on

the ground and on the buildings began; a slightly powdery snow, often semi-frozen and semi-melted, soaked in mud and certainly not as white as if it had just fallen. After various experiments always using the AK Interactive products 'Snow Terrains', 'Ice Sprinkles' 'Snow Microballons' and 'Snow Sprinkles', we made it with different mixes based on the effect to be obtained: more compact and 'fluffy' on the tree and on the roof of the











house, less compact, dirty and melting on the ground. This latter effect was obtained by increasing the amount of snow sprinkles combined with acrylic colours such as browns and greens to dirty-up the snow, AK 'Puddles Liquid' and Vallejo's 'Water Texture' which were also used extensively to reproduce puddles and fresh mud in combination with the specific product always AK 'Stirred Earth' splatter effect. It was time-consuming work that required patience and above all the ability to deal with images of real landscapes, achieving the result with multiple interventions, refining and improving the desired effect. Also because these products, of fundamental help, are not magical: you always need to know how to mix and use them, trying and experimenting with their qualities. The tree is produced by the Polish company Drzewa Modelarstwo specialized in the reproduction of trees and vegetation in different scales. https://drzewamodelarstwo.pl


# THE WILLYS JEEP WITH SNOWPLOUGH


As already noted, despite our research, the only photo of this model of Jeep with an operational bulldozer is the one relating to its presence near the village of Cobreville in January 1945 when the bloodiest phase of the German assault had run out. The model we made is the one produced by Tamiya (35219) and we added the Voyager Model set (PEA185) for the construction of the dozer-blade (pics 11, 12, 13, 14). When you decide to undertake a superdetail job it is good to study the instruction sheets of the various kits that you want to use in depth, to plan

• the various stages of assembly. Even if the model, as in this case, is small, it is good to decide immediately which and where the thicker plastic parts will be replaced, with the much finer photo-etched ones (pic 15).

The mount for the Browning M1919 was home-made using photo-etched scraps and rod of various sizes referring to photos found on the net (pic 16). We then enhanced the Jeep with additional stowage from dedicated set plus items from the infamous spares-box such as Historex, Dragons, Verlinden Productions and others. Both this vehicle and the Greyhound are equipped with bottles and crates from MiniArt's set 'Wine bottles & Wooden crates' (35571) plus reproductions of American magazines and maps by ETA Diorama Accessories, a Greek firm that reproduces on paper a remarkable number of accessories to enrich the authenticity of our models. www. facebook.com/yannis.v.papadopoulos.9 (pics 17, 18, 19, 20).





## RED FOX STUDIOS 1:48 MESSERSCHMITT ME262A-1 & A2 INSTRUMENT PANELS (RFSQS-48065) www.migjimenez.com

Tamiya's 1:48 Me262A-1 is twenty years old now and this new cockpit detail set from Red Fox (distributed exclusively by AMMO) gives it a spruce-up. The pack provides three-dimensional instrument

panel and side consoles, all pre-coloured and ready for installation (application?) to the kit panels which need their raised detail sanding off first. Colour-washes can be applied to help unify them with the rest of the cockpit.









# THE M8 GREYHOUND

Tamiya's 1:35 US M8 Light Armored Car 'Greyhound' Combat Patrol Set (25196) was used here and for the up-detailing we used two sets from Royal Model, one for the various photo-etched details of the vehicle and the other for the wheels with snow-chains. The latter are in resin as well as various details found in the first set, such as backpacks, bags that we will use later to make the vehicle look more operational (pics 21, 22, 23, 24). Taking inspiration from various images of this vehicle during the battle of the Ardennes, we eliminated parts of the fender and piled up boxes, supplies and tools to the engine hood that the crew brought along (pic 25). Since our diorama is set on terrain covered with thawing snow, giving way to mud and patches of dirty and disintegrated slush, our vehicles do not have a heavy white field camouflage, but the remnants of this effect, deteriorated by time, weather and combat.

For the painting of the vehicles, the same technique was used for both, with the only difference that for the Greyhound the white-wash



emphasise the shaded areas.

These are the basic techniques, then you go 'by feel', adding highlights and shadows with various oil colours and acrylic filters such as rust, oil drip, dust and mud, repeating these steps several times and emphasising other effects, until the imagined look is arrived at. At the end of this whole process, a soft pencil or graphite powder was used to simulate areas subject to most wear and tear (pics 26 to 30).

# THE FIGURINES

The figures that make up the diorama are from Alpine Miniatures and Scale 75 for the GIs plus the farmer with shovel, who is from Model Victoria. They were painted in acrylic using the excellent 'War Front' sets by Scale Color, which have the advantage of being slightly transparent, therefore, of being able to vary the intensity of the colour before applying lights and shadows. Furthermore, their consistency makes


























them similar to oil paints and they can be worked to produce halftones, without drying too quickly. You have to get used to this fluidity, but once you get the hang of it, their application together with their opacity allows you to create excellent shades.

Let's focus on the soldier holding the calf in his arms: the figures is 'Private First Class' by Scale75 and was modified by Bruno Carruolo, a skilled figure sculptor, who created the calf from scratch and adapted the soldier's posture to hold it. The result of this was an original piece which exactly reproduces the GI immortalised in the photo, in our opinion of considerable impact and which inspired the title of our diorama. The paints to reproduce his heavy coat are: Vallejo Flat Earth (70983), German Camouflage (70826), Marron Mat (70984) and US Dark

Brown (SW51) from Scale Color **[pics 31** to 43]. The black lacquered wooden base was produced by my friend Alessandro Schirone, the plates are computer printed and covered with transparent Kristal tape. The adhesives used are from the Cyano range of Colle 21: Slow Dry, Black and Universal. A special thanks goes to my friend and talented model maker Gennaro Zappa for the photo-shoot. •

# VORSPRUNG DURCH TECHNIK: IT'S A WRAP!



i guys, here I am with another build. This time one of my favourite subjects in modelling and in real life: race cars, specifically GT3s. which are the ones I most look forward to building. As a huge fan of racing it's a must for me to go to the 24 Hours Of Spa, as I love endurance racing and Spa is the perfect spot for it.

This time I'm using the NuNu 2015 Audi R8 LMS GT3 Macau FIA GT kit to create the 2016 Sepang Cup winner. The European importer was kind enough to sponsor me by supplying the kit, plus some others that will remain under wraps for now, because they will all appear in future issues of Tamiya Model Magazine

International. Also, SK Decals was kind enough to provide me with the replacement markings and carbon fibre decal sheets patterns A and B. KMP provided me the correct wheels for this kit, because the kit's rear wheels are too large as standard. Paints and clear-coats were supplied by Number 5. So, let's get started! •



## **♥** FIRST IMPRESSIONS: KIT AND ACCESSORIES

When I opened the box I noticed that all parts looked very sharp and well detailed. Following a closer inspection, I was very impressed and excited by this kit. The aftermarket wheels from KMP are a real gem, because of the high quality of the 3D-print, with no clean up needed. The set also includes brake discs, callipers, wheel-nuts and steering wheel. The replacement decals from SK Decals are a real challenge. It's a full body wrap and I had never done that before, but I was confident. The upgrade set from NuNu itself has a lot of detailed PE parts and three carbon fibre sheets, but I aimed to add a lot more using the ones from SK Decals.

## **CLEAN-UP AND TEST-FIT**

Like always, I trimmed all parts from their sprues and cleaned them up, giving them a good wash and letting them air dry in a large clear container. Next up I mounted the parts on alligator clamps and separated them into groups for different shades of primer because some of them need grey and white undercoats.

I looked at the PE parts that I was planning to use to bring more detail to the model and my friend from F1Stone printed some 3D parts for the interior, because I felt it was a bit naked without them. I also started to make my own templates for carbon-fibre decalling, mostly for the interior and engine bay.

# PRIMER AND BASE-COATS

I painted the parts with Alclad Grey and White primer/micro-filler where appropriate and left them to dry overnight. I divided them again for different finishes of black (gloss, semi-gloss and matt) plus Tamiya TS-8 and Zero Paints Audi Nardo Grey for the roll cage. After a night of curing, I painted the parts with different shades of Zero Metal colour such as Chrome, Aluminium, Steel, Titanium Silver and Titanium Gold.

## **ENGINE BAY**


The engine bay is moulded-in so I had to figure out which colour I would












paint first. Zero Paints Bright Red was the first choice for the valve covers (pic 1) and I then masked them off and applied Zero Paints Audi Nardo Grey (pic 2). I masked-up again and painted everything Semi-Gloss Black from Zero Paints. Masked yet again and painted the engine block and cover in Zero Metal Aluminium. Finally, the last masking operation was the engine block to painted the headers in titanium gold, according to the instructions (pic 3). I hand-painted

some parts in Vallejo Matt Black and started to apply carbon-fibre decals on the sides of the engine bay, cover and intake manifold (pic 4). I gave it all a fine coat of two-part clear and left it to harden for a few days (pic 5)







# **INTERIOR AND CHASSIS**

After priming and painting, I applied the home-made carbon-fibre templates to the interior, including the door cards. The carbon templates for the doors are included in the upgrade set from the kit. I also started on the floor, because it was necessary to complete everything so the wheels fit properly. After this was done, I started detailing the interior, starting with the seat first which lacked a bit of detail. So I applied some small strips of 'Leukosilk' tape (medical tape) and gave it a brush-coat of Tamiya Craft Bond thinned with water to hold the tape strips in place. I then gave it a few coats of Motip undercoat for cars the same as Tenco Proto scale fabric – to give it more detailed look (pic 5).

I made the seatbelts using the PE parts from the upgrade set and 3mm black satin ribbon (pic 7). I didn't glue them together with glue, but with double sided smartphone tape that I have been testing for over a year now. Works great and no glue marking and no waiting


this time. I then started with pre-assembly of the wiring to the electronics boxes using some mish-mash parts from Knupfer.info (pic 8).

# **CABIN DETAILING**

These are parts from mostly watches and work perfectly for modelling and great for making connectors. I also used them for the fire

extinguisher system in the car (pic 9) and it worked out perfectly. I made all the connections with 1.6mm shrink tube, so I could fill it up with one, two or even three 0.5mm wires I use. Used some 0.4mm wires from MFH for the fuse-box and some braided lines from Top Studio (pic 10). Connected it all and must say it look

pretty good. I glued the seat, dashboard (pic 11) and rollcage in place and called the interior done (pics 12, **13, 14)**. The suspension and brake hubs were glued in place and I then fitted the rotors and brake discs. I didn't glue it all together yet, because I might have to do some modifications for the ride height... •








## **O** WHEEL ARCH ISSUES

I placed the body onto the chassis and noticed the rear wheels (KMP) did not fit correctly in the wheel arches; they were rubbing against the front edge of the wheel arch [pic 15]. After some careful measuring I figured that the front of the rear wheel arch had to be opened up by 2mm, so I drew this onto the body and started to cut away some excess material [pic 15].

It was given a quick sanding and after dry-fitting again, it looked a lot better. I glued in a 0.5mm plastic strip to fine tune it and placed some two-part epoxy putty to even it out. It was

sanded back and dry-fitted again. It had improved but I still wasn't happy how the arches looked, so I made a tool using a large bolt wrapped with doubled sided tape, stuck on some 600-grit sandpaper, mounted it in my power-drill and started to sand the arches bit by bit to make them perfectly round (pic 17). This worked out great; I made a quick test fit again and the wheels-to-arch fit looked a whole lot better. I could finally paint the wheels and the body.

# THE BODY AND WHEELS

The body and wheels were primed with Tamiya Grey Primer, thinned 50/50 with Tamiya Lacquer Thinner. After a quick sanding of the body I painted it with Number 5 White. I then masked off the white at the rear and applied a few coats of Number 5 Black (pic 18). I could then paint the primed wheels, discs, rotors and callipers with Zero Paints Gloss Black. The tyres were painted with Tyre Black from Zero and I gave it an extra thin coat of two-part clear from Number 5 and left it to dry for a week, because it was time for a long-awaited vacation! (pics 19, 20). The day I came back I

The day I came back I painted the callipers, discs and rotors their metal

colours from Zero Paints and started applying the SK decals to the body. I had never done a full-wrap before so this was a new challenge for me. I started with the bonnet and worked my way up to the wings. From here I went over the doors and the roof, then the quarter panels to the rear of the car (pics 21, 22, 23).

Again I was very impressed with the quality of the markings from SK Decals. They were really thin and laid down with some Daco Strong setting solution, plus some heat from a hairdryer to conform around edges, wheel arches and convex shapes. Most of them were





placed without any heat or decal setting solution, because it wasn't needed. They are best decals I have ever used. After a few days of curing I dry-fitted the windows then and masked them off and cut out the templates. I painted the trim with Tamiya X-18 Semi-Gloss Black and left it to dry overnight. A few coats of Tamiya X-27 Clear Red

were applied over the tail-lights and I could then begin final assembly.

# **FINAL THOUGHTS**

After it was done, I was kind of glad it was finished. Not in a bad way, because the kit was really pleasant to build

and I didn't have any issues. The decals for the body and especially the carbon fibre took a lot of time and that's why it took so long to finish this build. I'm glad I built it and would build it again with the Evo that is coming out. I had a great time with the challenge of the full decal wrap; I'm definitely I'm going to do that again! I want to









This pair of tiny US Navy Kingfisher observation float-planes is, of course, intended for use on model ships but they are so beautifully detailed they would make fun projects in their own right. They are formed by the 3D-printing process and are supplemented by a small fret of PE brass which provides the propellers, aerials, pitots and cradle for the main float. Stunning little kits!











The LP-4 Flat White was thinned heavily with Tamiya Lacquer Thinner Retarder Type (70/30 thinners to paint) and applied in light layers

Airbrushing in light layers allows a gradual paint build-up, creating a smooth surface and letting some of the black undercoat to show through, giving depth to the white. The lwata Custom Micron Takuma was used exclusively here







The Luger, Mauser and Colt were used in WWI, and then with the Walther they served in WW2. The Glock is a 'modern' weapon, very widely used. To get hold of SSR products, it is best to contact via their Facebook page, although some shops are beginning to stock the range. Eyewatering detail in 1:35 weapons, suitable for many uses, but it would be useful to have closed and open holsters for each pistol type. CLS

These products are 'gloopy' acrylic mixes with the appropriate texture and colour for groundwork on a diorama or vignette. The size of the granularity in the texture would make these most appropriate for 1:35 bases, possible for 1:48. The material certainly saves time and can produce an excellent surface for future work. It is possible to mix in acrylic paints or pastel powders to vary the appearance and while wet it can have vegetation or objects inserted into the surface. The acrylic dries to a resistant surface, into which cracks can be scribed and so on. In summary, these products can be used to save a lot of time, by producing a reasonable colour and texture out of the pot. Each container is filled with 100ml of the compound, which is sufficient for covering a significant area on a base, depending on the thickness used. CLS





The innocent-looking WW2 Japanese Kokusai Ta-Go aircraft was designed with one tragic purpose in mind; to create a cheap and quick-to-construct kamikaze aircraft for use against Allied vessels, armoured columns and troops, in anticipation of the invasion of the Japanese home islands by the Allies in 1945, known as Operation Downfall and Operation Olympic. The aircraft's construction was mostly from non-strategic materials such as wood and fabric giving it a simplistic appearance and Brengun have done a marvellous job of capturing this in miniature form. In 1:72 the Ta-Go is a pretty small model but the detail is there, with wing ribs and recessed panel-lines on the fuselage in evidence. It comes moulded on a single sprue of blue-grey polystyrene, with a clear windscreen and a sheet of waterslide markings for one machine in overall dark olive drab. The cockpit is basic - most likely echoing the real thing - with just a floor, seat, rudder pedals, control column and instrument panel. The latter is provided with dial-decals and with lead-foil some seat harnesses, it will be perfectly adequate. One area that could use a little refinement is the single, centre-line bomb whose fins are too thick for this scale; photo-etched replacements would be useful here. It's a short-run kit so some old-school modelling skills will be needed, but it's an interesting subject an a neat little presentation. TMMI



Italeri's truck models were well ahead of their time in terms of detail, accuracy and precision and Italeri's 1:24 F12 1981 kit is proof of that; the parts still look crisp and well detailed, even if a little extra clean-up might be required. Several iterations of the 1:24 F12 have appeared over the years with different liveries and new parts, most significantly the inclusion of a 'high roof' with horns and lights for the 'Globetrotter' version in the '80s. The newest incarnation is the 'low roof' design and here we are treated to some fun additions such as the Michelin 'Bibendum' man as well as some other commercial mascot figures in the same vein. On the sprue of accessories you'll also find further items such as fire extinguishers, 'high top' roof, ladder, stowage racks and other custom parts. A new decal sheet provides graphics for some groovy 1970s paint schemes and they all look very retro-cool. Italeri's decals are produced to a famously high quality and these will look fantastic, whichever livery you opt for. A full engine, detailed chassis, suspension and a comprehensive





returned in 1971 with only minor modifications from the previous year. The 1971 4-4-2 was available in a hardtop coupe and convertible body type. The sport coupé disappeared for the first time since 1964, only to return in 1972. 1971 Model-year appearance changes included a black grille with silver surround, silver headlight bezels, round parking lights in the front bumper and horizontal tail lights. Quartermile performance as reported by Road Test magazine was 15.2 seconds at 99mph (159 km/h), and 0-60 mph in 8.9 seconds. (Wikipedia). Revell originally released their 1:25 Oldsmobile 442 kit back in 2009 as a 1972 Cutlass (convertible) and other variants followed in relatively quick succession. With this 2022 edition we are treated to a hardtop bodyshell in the box which creates the 1971 coupé, a betterlooking muscle-car than the softtop, in this reviewer's opinion. The same excellent underpinnings are present, all of which are very well detailed but hard to see thanks to the slightly translucent white plastic in which the kit is moulded; the raw plastic is extremely difficult to photograph too! The engine is the star here and it comes with some really nice detail parts. With the addition of some ignition and battery wires (not included) it'll look excellent and fully viewable thanks to the hinged bonnet/hood. The cabin captures the 1970s look perfectly and the undersides are well rendered, too. All in all, another excellent Revell muscle car with heaps of stance



#### The RAF's twin-engined WW2 workhorse has been immortalised in polystyrene thanks to Airfix and they've done an amazing job of it

he Anson was a British twin-engined, multi-role aircraft built by the aircraft manufacturer AVRO. Large numbers of the type served in a variety of roles for the Royal Air Force, Fleet Air Arm, Royal Canadian Air Force and numerous other air forces before, during and after the Second World War. Initially known as the Avro 652A, the Anson was developed during the mid-1930s from the earlier Avro 652 airliner in response to a request for tenders issued by the British Air Ministry for a maritime reconnaissance aircraft. Having suitably impressed

the Ministry, a single prototype was ordered, which conducted its maiden flight on 24th March 1935. Following an evaluation in which the Type 652A bettered the competing de Havilland DH.89, it was selected as the winner, leading to Air Ministry Specification 18/35 being written around the type and an initial order for 174 aircraft being ordered in July 1935.

The Type 652A was promptly named after British Admiral George Anson. The Anson entered service with the Royal Air Force and was initially used in the envisaged maritime reconnaissance operation alongside the larger flying boats. After the outbreak of the Second World War the Anson was soon found to have become obsolete in front line combat roles. Large numbers of the type were instead put to use as a multi-engined aircrew trainer, having been found to be suitable for the role and became the mainstay of the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan. The Anson continued to be used in this role throughout and after the conflict, the final RAF example was only withdrawn from service as a station communications aircraft in 1968. 11,000 Ansons eventually produced. #### **AIRFIX ANSON IN 1:48**

Although it's not perhaps the most glamorous of aircraft in the RAF's WW2 inventory, the Anson has a charismatic appeal of its own and it makes a terrific subject for a model kit. Airfix released their 1:72 Anson back way in 1962 and now, sixty years later, we have a brand-new model in 1:48 and what a delightful production it is. One clear and six grey sprues make up the model, which comes in a mid-sized box topped with a stunning colour illustration by Adam Tooby. Surface detail is superb with an incredibly convincing representation of the structural ribbing and stringers beneath the airframe's surface. That greenhouse-like glazing is taken care

of by crystal-clear mouldings and it'll be worth performing many test-fit operations before applying cement to avoid smears! All we need now is a set of pre-cut masks from Eduard to make the painting process easier..

Weighted tyres, recessed panel line and fastener detail and a general air of sophistication make this kit and extremely appealing proposition and we will be starting construction soon!





**ARRAS COUNTER-ATTACK 1940** TIM SAUNDERS, PEN & SWORD MILITARY www.pen-and-sword.co.uk

The German advance through Belgium and France in 1940 was so fast that it was called Blitzkrieg; Lightning War. Undeniably, this German attack was a master stroke, sweeping aside numerically superior enemies and out-manoeuvring more ponderous opponents. The British Army at this time was fully mechanised and the BEF had many advantages although weaker tactically and strategically. When all seemed lost, on 21st May 1940 the BEF struck back, throwing two tank regiments against the flank of the 7th Panzer Division. This blow was completely unanticipated and the German units began to collapse until Erwin Rommel rallied his division and used his 88mm anti-aircraft guns to stop the British Matildas. This book is a fantastic account of the lead-up and the attack which had hoped to grab Arras, a transport hub. The descriptions of events are supported by personal memoirs and a great

lunge into the German flanks contributed to Hitler ordering his forces to halt, allowing the British and French armies to escape from Dunkirk. This book in 200 pages covers the topic in a very readable and informative style, providing a great resource for a competitive price. CLS














**ALLIED ARMIES IN SICILY AND ITALY 1943-1945**

After the defeat of Axis forces in North Africa, the Allies decided to thrust up into the 'soft belly of Europe, first taking the large island of Sicily and then invading Italy. These attacks immediately eased the pressure on shipping routes through the Mediterranean, but the land battles turned out to be much tougher than anticipated, with the Axis stubbornly resisting from terrain that favoured the emplaced defenders. Feeling ignored by the public, and spawning the song 'D-Day Dodgers', the armies in Italy faced extremely tough fighting against experienced opponents and this book helps to restore the balance with 144 pages of photos and narrative.



The photos are well-chosen, mainly rarely seen before and the captions are very informative. Overall, this book provides a clear understanding of events from the 1943 Husky landings on Sicily through to Venice and Milan, and the Axis surrender on 2nd May 1945. This is a great resource for historians and modellers, illustrating the brutality of the fighting in heat, mud and mountains. CLS






