1:24 Model A Standard Phaeton Soft Top 1930s (24050) new tool

Much of ICM's vehicular output is in 1:35 but they do also have a thriving line of 1:24 models of which the 'Model A' (Ford) is the latest and what a little beauty it is. The kit builds up rather like the real thing, with a ladder chassis, lateral leaf-spring suspension, straight-four engine and pushrod brakes all coming together nicely, and detailed beautifully. 1:35 German 3t Cargo Truck 3,6-36S Early Prod. PmQ-Type (35445) new version

MiniArt's 1:35 Opel Blitz continues to evolve. We looked at the 'Pritsche-Normal-Type' civilian variant last issue and now, the military version has arrived at TMMI. Here, we have a new cargo bed with taller side panels and a stack of roof-hoops for a tarpaulin cover for this area. That particular part isn't included, so the modeller with have to turn to the aftermarket for a cover. 1:350 Project 20380 early production (6012) new tool

Takom is creating some excellent ships these days and this Steregushchiy-class corvette is one of the latest. The real thing is used for littoral zone (coastline) operations, engagement of enemy submarines and surface ships, and support of landing operations. The hull is approximately thirty centimetres (twelve inches) in length and is subtly detailed. The kit comes with decals and photo-etched parts, including railings and mast components. www.bachmann.co.uk and good retailers everywhere



1:35 Studebaker US6-US WWII US Gasoline Tank Truck (35492) new parts

As with the 1:24 Model A, ICM's 1:35 Studebaker comes with engine, chassis and suspension detail and needs little if any extra detail adding to the lower areas. The new parts are for the pair of large fuel tanks that sit over the rear chassis rails, plus the storage racks designed for five-gallon jerrycans for quick access. Gorgeous detail but you might want to find PE or 3D-print front grilles for the best scale-appearance (www. fcmodeltrend.com) www.icm.com.ua www.hannants.co.uk and good retailers everywhere



1:35 Sd.Kfz.234/4 Schwerer Panzerspähwagen 7.5cm Interior Kit (35427) new version

The first thing that you might say when looking at this kit in its box is, wow! We certainly did. Arguably the most interesting variant of the eight-wheel Sd.Kfz.234 series is this 7.5cm Pak40-armed machine, of which less than ninety were built from 1944 to '45. From a modelling point of view it makes a brilliant subject thanks to the open top (you can see much of the main gun and hull interior) and this edition comes with the engine too. www.miniart-models.com www.creativemodels.co.uk



1:350 Type 192 & Type 192A Harbour Tugboat (6011) new tool

The differences between these two hefty tugboats are very subtle and the overwhelming majority of the kit parts are identical, and all extremely well detailed. The lower (waterline only) hulls measure 105mm in length and within that space, Takom have packed in quite a lot of parts, give these models a pleasingly busy appearance. Photo-etched railings, ladders and other items are provided. www.bachmann.co.uk and good retailers everywhere

PANZERKAMPFWAGEN I AUSF.B SD.KFZ.101

Tamiya's newest 1:35 tank depicts the early-war Panzer I Ausf. B completing the 1:35 line-up of German WW2 tanks in Tamiya's catalogue



lthough Germany was forbidden to develop tanks after its defeat in World War I, it developed the Panzerkampfwagen I under the title of 'agricultural tractor' to divert suspicion of rearmament and the Pz.Kpfw.I became a mass-produced tank. The Ausf. B's engine was upgraded to 100hp, almost double the 57hp of the Ausf. A. It also had a 40cm longer hull and was equipped with a pair of 7.92mm MG13 machine guns. While the Pz.Kpfw.I was developed for training, it first saw combat action in Spain during the Spanish Civil War and was used extensively in various situations such as the invasion of Poland and the Eastern Front.

Tamiya's launch of this 100% new kit has delighted fans of World War Two armour, and TMMI too! The Panzerkampfwagen I is a tiny thing and in 1:35 measures just 123mm – just under five inches – in length. Despite these diminutive dimensions, Tamiya's new kit certainly doesn't lack detail, with kit parts being spread across four sprues of panzer-grey polystyrene, plus one in clear and one photo-etched nickel-steel fret. The tracks are miniscule but haven't been skimped on and come in the form of links and lengths, the upper runs of which incorporate just the correct degree of 'sag' between roadwheels.

In order to guarantee the best possible rendition of the latter, the inner, sixspoked wheels are moulded individually and sandwiched between tyre halves during assembly. This is a really nice design idea and allows the wheels to gain an additional level of threedimensionality that one-piece parts could not attain.

Onto the upper hull and here, the two-part crew access door is moulded in separate pieces and could be fitted in the open position. There's no interior detail but this option does mean an aftermarket crew figure could be placed in aperture without the need to cut into the hull.

Aside from the main visual difference between Panzers I 'A' and 'B' of an extra roadwheel for the































○ latter, the other notable variation is the position of the exhaust systems. On the 'A' they are mounted on the rear of the track-guards but on the 'B' the single exhaust box will be found on the hull's rear panel. To accurately represent its heat-shroud, Tamiya provide a neat photo-etched part, plus a two-part press/ former to bend it to the correct shape. This echoes the PE formers in the recent Leopard 2A7V (featured in TMMI 342, 343, 344) for the PE turret side-bins and the system works well.


As mentioned, the kit comes without interior detail, but the twin 7.92mm MG13 machine guns are provided in full for the turret mantlet, as their rearmost sections are just visible with the big turret hatch open to accommodate the commander figure. The figure is extremely well done and captures the look of an early-war panzer crewman to perfection, right down to the option of a field-cap or the characteristically large beret: two heads accommodate this option.


Overall then, this is a superb newcomer to Tamiya's Military Miniatures Series and its addition means that all of the main German tanks of World War II are now all represented in 1:35 by Tamiya. The kit presents a pleasing challenge to modellers in getting the panzergrau correct and brought to life with imaginative weathering!














Jason Brewer has built numerous Eduard Bf109s in 1:72 but how does Tamiya's gorgeous little Gustav compare?







love building '109s and while many modellers are tired of more and more kits being released, I'm in the camp that's still looking for that one model that gets all of the little nuances correct. Having built many of the Eduard kit, I figured I was doing myself a disservice by not giving Tamiya's offering a shot. I have a closet full of Eduard kits, so I was a bit worried that I would be spoiled by Tamiya given their stellar reputation. Let's have a look.

Starting with the cockpit, the detail out of the box is excellent. Busy enough to look the part with a logical and easy to assemble parts breakdown. I did replace the seat with a resin one

from BarracudaCast, a little more accurate and detailed plus moulded-on belts. I also replaced the instrument panel with a Yahu panel, but the rest of the 'office' was completed straight from the box. No complaints here. Everything was painted with Tamiya XF-24, my go-to scale equivalent of RLM66 and details were picked out with Vallejo acrylics.

FILL THE DETAIL


Moving on to the airframe, things start to get a bit tedious. There are numerous hatches and access ports that need to be filled as Tamiya has moulded one fuselage and wing that can be used for multiple variants. The option to display the engine is nice,


but for guys like me who build stuff closed-up I found it a bit over-engineered, with a very high parts count that seemed a little unnecessary. That being said, it is still a Tamiya kit and everything went together as intended with no major fit issues. I left out all of the magnets in the nose and glued the parts in place. Some minor gaps around the engine cowling only required a touch of AK Interactive grey putty and a swipe of lacquer thinner to wipe away the excess. The plane I selected required the tall tail of the later variants so I used the excellent conversion set from BarracudaCast that is a direct replacement for the kit vertical stabiliser and

rudder. The plastic kit gun barrels were also cut off prior to paint and later replaced with Albion Alloys tubing.

From here it was business as usual. AK Interactive Real Colors paints were used for the camouflage, EagleCals decals for the markings and AK Interactive Paneliners for washes and filters. The exhaust stain was done with heavily thinned Tamiya Acrylics sprayed at a low pressure and slowly built up. The kit exhaust pieces were replaced with hollowed-out replacements from Quickboost and I turned once again to BarracudaCast for some lovely detailed main wheels. Sealing in all of that work are AK's Matte and Ultra Matte varnishes.







○ SO, THE VERDICT? Tamiya's Bf109G-6 does a great job of capturing the shape of the Bf109 and has some great features missing from other kits that make some of the trickier nuances easier to get right. Of note are the gear legs and canopy which simply cannot be installed wrong. Overall? I feel like the option to display the engine was a bit too much for me and made the build more complicated than I've come to expect from Tamiya. I would definitely build another, though, especially if I wanted to display the kit's excellent DB605.



ho'd ever have thought we'd have a large-scale kit – in injectionmoulded polystyrene – of the British World War Two Universal Carrier? Well, it's 2024 and all sorts of things are possible now, and Gecko Models has obliged with the extraordinary model you see here. Forty+ sprues of grey polystyrene, a sheet of photo-etched brass, braided copper wire, a length of copper chain and waterslide


decals will be found inside the deep box, along with a thirty-two page instruction booklet to guide the modeller through the fifty or so steps of construction.

The kit comes with fully articulated tracks which, on the Carrier, are of a very fine pitch. This results in no less than 167 links per side, each one connected to the next by a pair of moulded pins inserted from the outer edges. The links' removal from sprues, clean-up


and assembly will be an evening's work, so one might want to brew a coffee (or something stronger), put on some music and get into the groove when joining them all up! The result will certainly be worth the effort though, as you can see nearly the entire run on each side thanks to the vehicle's open-sided design.

Before you reach the tracks though, you'll have already assembled the lower hull and suspension, and here again we have some supremely well detailed parts, the suspension bogies and their slide-moulded springs being highlights. Gecko has taken no shortcuts here: the temptation would have been to mould the springs in with the suspension arms but in this scale it would have looked like a big compromise, so they did it the 'hard' (but superior) way.



The Metallic Details engines and pylons are a very nice upgrade over the kit engines. Preparing and assembling all the parts took quite some time but the result is well worth the effort (pics 11, 12). The final parts that were upgraded were the outer wing pylons and Harpoon missiles. Sway braces from my spares box were glued under the pylons and the missiles were spiced up with photo-etch details (pic 13). I decided to paint this model in low-viz colours because I like the heavy weathered appearance of the real aircraft. First, I started with a coat of black primer.

This is not only a good base to build up thin coats of paints but will also show any errors on the surface of the model. Painting started with very thin Mr Hobby H308 Grey FS36375, building up the colour randomly. Using heavier and lighter applications of paint will give a lighter or darker result because of the black base [pic 14].

Mixing small amounts of H308 with a some drops of white, a few panels were painted slightly lighter. Also, random spots were painted lighter, using photos of the real planes as a guide [pic 15].

he M8 light armoured car was a 6×6 vehicle produced by the Ford Motor Company during World War II. It was used from 1943 by United States and British forces in Europe and the Pacific until the end of the War. The vehicle was widely exported and as of 2024 still remained in service with some countries. In British service, the M8 was known as the 'Greyhound', a service name seldom, if ever, used by the US. The British Army found it too lightly armoured, particularly the hull floor, which anti-tank mines could easily penetrate (the crews' solution was lining the floor of the crew compartment with sandbags). Nevertheless, it was produced in large numbers. The M8 Greyhound's excellent road mobility made it a great supportive element in the advancing American and British armoured columns (Wikipedia).

Largely thanks to the outstanding efforts of Andy Klein and his 'Andy's Hobby Headquarters' brand, the 'big' scale of 1:16 has had a serious revival of late, the company producing some incredible kits, all at very reasonable prices considering the size of them. One of the newest is the M8 Light Armoured Car, an American battlefield icon of World War Two and handsome machine to boot.

ARMOURED GAR

The kit comprises eighteen sprues of grey polystyrene (plus hull floor), one sprue of clear plastic, an aluminium main gun barrel, two lengths of braided copper wire, a small fret of photo-etched brass and a sheet two sheets of waterslide decals, one carrying national insignia and vehicle numbers, the other providing a plethora of data placards, dashboard instrument faces and uniform insignia for the crew figure provided.

It's a magnificent box-load of parts and a mouthwatering proposition: as we stated in the preview of Gecko Models's Universal Carrier, who'd ever have thought we would ever have a 1:16 kit of this vehicle offered to us? The box-top wording states that the kit is made in cooperation with Takom, so we are in good hands here, as they have a lot of experience in producing highly detailed and accurate models that are well engineered and go together really nicely.

Having stated the kit comes on eighteen sprues, it is not a overwhelmingly complex project, and it shouldn't take ages to assemble. No engine is included and this will speed up construction, leaving more of that precious workbench time to paint and weather it up. Decals are included for ten US Greyhounds, plus


one captured machine in German markings if you fancy something a little different. In our opinion, the US Army schemes are the ones to go for though!

Spencer Pollard takes a break from armour and aircraft to build a rather more glamorous subject, Tamiya's reissue of their classic, 1978 kit of the stunning Toyota Celica GR.5. Let the polishing begin...





he Toyota Celica LB Turbo was a Group 5 car developed for the 1977 DRM (German Racing Championship). Based upon the road car Celica Liftback 2000GT, the car featured aerodynamic components such as bulging over fenders and rear wing, and employed numerous FRP body panels, which helped keep its weight down to a mere 860kg. A body extensively modified by Schnitzer and a 2,090cc, 560hp inline-4 DOHC turbo engine were utilised. This car made its debut in July 1977, and in October of the same year, it beat the Porsche 935 and achieved


its maiden victory.

It's very rare that I receive model kits as gifts, so when my wife bought me Tamiya's reissued Toyota Celica for Christmas last year, I knew that I would have to build it as soon as I could and not just add it to a never-ending pile of planned projects. Originally released in 1978, Tamiya's recreation of this classic Group 5 racing car quickly became a standout part of Tamiya's growing range of 1:20 kits. When it then formed the centrepiece of one of Francois Verlinden's diorama's in the following year's Tamiya catalogue, its classic status was set in stone.



Despite its age, the parts are still beautifully moulded, with absolutely no evidence of flash, only mould lines, unsurprisingly present, needing to be cleaned up...




Here are the two washes that I used to weather the inside of my model. Being enamel based, both are easy to apply and then clean-up with white spirit




Test-fitting the roll cage. Deviating from the instructions, this was constructed as one large piece, painted and then fixed in place. As with much of the interior, the roll cage is painted with an overall layer of TS-15 Gloss Blue



There is not a lot of colour inside the cabin, these bright red gas bottles being about it. These were painted in gloss red and then decorated with decals supplied in the kit. Games Workshop Stormhost Silver was used to add the strap detail




Detail inside the cabin is rather sparse, so repays careful painting to get the best from it. Note those dials mentioned earlier and how the combination of decals and UV resin has created a most pleasing appearance



The front suspension unit and wheels are now in place, ready for the engine. Despite much sanding, I couldn't remove the mould seams from the edges of the tyres, so this is the best I could do! Hopefully they will look okay when surrounded by the rest of my planned diorama



The 2090cc Toyota engine is a remarkably simple sub-assembly that combines assembled and painted parts with plated details. From the off, I decided that I wanted to create a model that exhibited weathering around the interior and the engine bay, so used washes to bring out the detail, both AK and Tamiya washes coming into play at this point. Great care was taken to ensure that different components looked to be made from different materials, the rusty exhaust being uppermost in my mind as assembly and painting was carried out



The engine proved to be a real struggle to locate, some careful trimming and no little force being needed to sit it correctly in place on top of its mounts. During this fraught part of the kit's assembly, I managed to wipe away my weathering around the exhausts, resulting in some unwanted touching up before the model was complete...




The roll cage is now in place along with the dash and steering wheel.

Note the look of the instrument dials, dealt with in an identical manner to that seen earlier and the painting of the steering wheel. It was the little details such as these that made this model such fun to build and paint





The engine is now in place and the exhaust, repainted. Once superglued to its mounts (superglue being used to create an instant, hard-wearing joint!) the engine and surrounding structures were weathered in with oversprayed layers of Tamiya Red Brown, darkened with Flat Black. Applied in thin layers, this colour created the illusion of track dirt having been thrown up into the engine bay



Further layers of dirt were added by flicking thinned oil paint over the engine and ancillary parts and then blending those spots in with a soft, flat brush. Chips and stretches were also added to the subframe using Vallejo acrylics, not too much, just enough to impart the illusion of use and wear

Decals were applied using Mr.Mark Softer as a softening agent. Though the decals in this kit were printed by Cartograf so I could have used other solutions, I decided to give the new Mr. Mark Softer a run out to see how it fared against the old formulation. The answer? Very well, indeed!

Finishing Compound and some



HORAH FOR MAIN McConnachie brings us another postalgic look


Neil McConnachie brings us another nostalgic look at a classic Matchbox model, Monty's Caravan in 1:76

happy memories for most modellers of a certain age and were one of the reasons most of us build models to this day (definitely! Ed). The box-art was a major attraction to wide-eyed school boys clasping their pocket-money, making his purchasing decision a no-brainer.

Who can forget the range of AFVs with their multicoloured sprues and dioramas of varies complexities. My favourite box-arts were the action-packed Afrikakorps Hanomag speeding away from an attacking Hurricane, desperately firing back with its MG34 and the American M16 blazing away with its quad .50cal turret, making somebody on the receiving end wishing they were somewhere else, rather sharpish... Then, if you had washed the family car or had some birthday money on the hip, the larger kit featuring two or more vehicles of various types, on larger, more complex dioramas became affordable. Highlights included the epic Diamond T with trailer or the LRDG set with Chevrolet truck and Jeep, groaning under the weight of stowage and weapons, both sets with crew figures.


All this action came in the scale of 1:76 and a total of twenty-seven were produced by Matchbox, all of WW2 era except a Challenger 1 tank that crept in there somehow. I have built all of them over the years, several times and I still find them as satisfying as I did when I was eleven. Almost without exception they build up with out any problems with pretty good fit of parts, leaving the builder to get to work constructing the diorama and completing their masterpiece.





FULL-BUILD RETRO-MODELLING

MATCHBOX 1:76 MONTY'S CARAVAN · KIT NO.40175



a Matchbox kit from 1983 and its none other than a Leyland Retriever in the guise of Monty's Caravan, along with Daimler Dingo scout car. The diorama includes a base of a cobbled street with tram-tracks and a demolished statue of some description. Included in the kit are two barriers, a couple of oil drums and of course Field Marshal Bernard Montgomery with a couple of his staff members being instructed in the next 'grand plan' for the War. The kit does offer two markings, one for northern Europe and

one for North Africa and the diorama base works for both.

The instructions are broken down into just eleven stages but they are well drawn and simple to follow. Starting with the Retriever, the driver's cab and chassis are nicely detailed and more than enough to give a busy appearance. The caravan has a lovely textured surface to represent the canvas material: okay it's a little heavy, but I like it. The interior only has a partition wall but nothing else so it's up the modeller to add the interior if that's desired

and there are plenty of references out there. Or, if you are very keen, a trip to the Imperial War Museum at Duxford will allow you to see the real thing in all its glory, which is highly recommended.

Moving on to what must be the cutest of all military vehicles, the Daimler Dingo and as you would expect it builds up with no issues and again the interior detail is more than enough to satisfy most. Both the Retriever and the Dingo do have a number of small fiddly parts and are enough to keep both the novice and more experienced modeller happy. I do think Matchbox got this balance just right, not too easy but this approach kept everyone happy. Now, after all the models had been built up, they all received a light blast of Halfords grey primer and set aside to dry overnight.





COLOUR SCHEME?

Now to choose which colour scheme to go for, and I decided on the European green finish. I loaded up the airbrush with Revell 363 Green thinned with cellulose thinners and dusted the model with light coats until a nice smooth solid colour was achieved. A quick note to mention, I choose that specific green as it had a little more 'colour' to it which I find helps on smaller scale models and gives them a bit more character for the size. This was followed by a light dusting of Revell 82 Earth on the lower part of the vehicles. A custom mix of oil paint thinned with white spirit was used as a localised colour-wash, applied to all the recesses and panel lines, making sure not to swamp the model, followed by a drybrush of titanium buff oil paint. The decals were then applied over targeted coats of gloss varnish and after picking out smaller details, the models were given a coat

of Vallejo matt varnish.

At this stage I had not glued the Retrievers roof on as I was planning to add some glazing to keep Monty warm and dry. I simply cut clear plastic card to a slightly larger dimension than the window apertures and affixed with Krystal Klear from Microscale, then glued on the roof. And there we have it! The diorama base was painted primarily with Vallejo water based paints and were applied as if it was a 3D painting, mixing and applying water and other colours as I went. This then got an application of my thinned oil paint mixture and when dry a light drybrush was applied to lift the superb moulded detail of the diorama base. Monty and his staff were also painted with Vallejo paints and the diorama was populated by the vehicles and the figures and barriers added to complete this tiny vignette.

This was a very pleasing build and reminded me



why I build models, so if you are getting bogged down with resin or etched brass or the 700+ parts in some kits merely to build an ejector seat, I urge you to return to your roots and build something simple and straightforward: I'm sure you will find it rewarding. As for the tiny models with dioramas, I'm a 100% sure there is a gap in the market to be filled by resurrecting this concept. Are you listening, Airfix? ●

ARMA HOBBY 1:48 P-39Q AIRACOBRA • KIT NO.40010



P-39Q AIRACOBRA

he Bell P-39 Airacobra was a fighter produced by Bell Aircraft for the United States Army Air Force during World War II and was one of the principal American fighters in service when the United States entered combat. The P-39 was used by the Soviet Air Force and enabled individual Soviet pilots to score the highest number of kills attributed to any US fighter-type flown by any air force in any conflict. Other major users of the type included the Royal Air Force, Free French, and the Italian Co-Belligerent Air Force.

It had an unusual layout, with the engine installed in the mid-fuselage behind the pilot, driving a tractor-propeller in the nose via a long shaft. It was also the first fighter fitted with a tricycle undercarriage.

Although its mid-engine placement was innovative, the P-39 design was handicapped by the absence of an efficient turbosupercharger, preventing it from performing high-altitude work. For this reason it was rejected by the RAF for use over western Europe but adopted by the USSR, where most air combat took place at medium and lower altitudes. (History edited from Wikipedia).

At TMMI, we have heaped praise upon Arma Hobby's ultra-sharp and exquisitely detailed 1:48 Hawker Hurricane kits released over the last couple of years and so we were extremely keen to see their 1:48 P-39Q Airacobra, a new-tool kit for 2024. The model arrives on three sprues of pale grey polystyrene plus one in clear, three steel ball bearings that

act as nose-weights, decals with three markings-options, pre-cut canopy and wheel masks, plus 3D-printed resin main undercarriage doors and nose intake scoops.

The all-important cockpit is a fantastic replica of the real deal, with an open/ closed option for the pilot's doors/side windows which show it off to perfection. The inner faces of the doors are particularly well done, moulded in clear with excellent raised detail with data-placards in decal-form. The instrument panel has very finely raised bezels and once painted black, a decal with dial detail is applied over it, a simple and very effective approach. The airframe replicates the all-metal construction of Bell's original extremely well, and it feels necessarily 'smoother' to the touch than the Hurricanes giving the


impression that it's not as intricately detailed, but it is supremely well done and will look magnificent under whichever paint and decal scheme you chose. Another triumph from Arma Hobby, let's hope there are many more to come.

Airfix released their 1:35 Cromwell tank kit in 2021, so it's a recent, modern and high-quality model of this low-slung World War Two British cruiser tank. Upon opening the wide, flat box you'll find seven sprues of varying sizes moulded in sand-coloured polystyrene, two sprues in black plastic, a strip of polycaps, flexible vinyl tracks, a fret of photo-etched brass and a sheet of decals carrying two markings-options. The lower hull builds up panel by panel and incorporates the Christie-type suspension typical of British tanks from this era. The detail is excellent throughout

and the provision of finely etched mesh for the engine exhaust is very welcome, adding a touch of scalelike refinement to this area. General assembly looks straightforward and it should be a good kit for a relative beginner to tackle, but this does not imply that the model is somehow simplistic, it certainly isn't. There are some nice options included, such as a 95mm howitzer barrel to create a Cruiser Tank Mk.VIII (Cromwell Mk.VI) plus the standard 75mm OQF gun for the Cromwell Mk.IV.The 'Normandy cowl' exhaust shroud will be found on sprue F and there's also a Cullin-type hedgerow cutter on the same sprue. Other nice touches are open or closed driver/radio operator hatches, hollow tipped Besa gun barrel, panel-by-panel turret structure for superior detail rendition and correctly detailed fire extinguishers. One major option, which could persuade some modellers to buy this kit is the inclusion of both linkand-length tracks in hard kit plastic (those two black sprues mentioned earlier) plus a pair of tracks in flexible vinyl material, both extremely well executed. Markings for a Cruiser Tank Mk.VIII (Cromwell Mk.~IV) of No.2 Squadron, 2nd Armoured Reconnaissance Battalion, Welsh Guards and a Cruiser Tank Mk.VIII (Cromwell Mk.VI) of B Company, 4th County of London Yeomanry top off









GECKO MODELS, CHINA BRITISH WWII TRACTOR, 4X4 FIELD ARTILLERY (C8 Mk.II, LATE)

The Morris-Commercial Quad – so called because it had 4-wheel

drive – was one of a number of Field Artillery Tractors (FAT) that were typically used to tow the 25pdr gun and limber. These vehicles were found everywhere that Commonwealth forces were in action, from 1939 through to the end of WW2. The 'beetleback' shape was apparently chosen to make decontamination easier in the event of a gas attack, and the same shape was used on all FAT vehicles until the No.5 body appeared in 1944. The kit from Gecko is extremely well detailed, and captures the features of the late Mk.II which had an open roof for better ventilation. As with all recent Gecko kits the detail is exquisite, with fine etched brass for the tiny details, and superb moulding of the plastic parts. The one issue of bad planning is that Gecko moulded the windscreen wipers in the middle of the glass, not in the 'parked' position at the top of the screen. This makes the wipers hard to paint, but they are annoyingly in the centre of the window. It would have been so very much better to provide separate wipers instead of moulding them on the clear glass part. Aside from this problem, the kit provides both early and late rifles, plus a Sten which appeared in 1942 onwards. Altogether, a lot of research went into this kit, resulting in a vehicle that will be much in demand. The single fault for some modellers will be the clear plastic parts, which are overly thick and lack the care that went into the rest of the model. **CLS**


The Ukrainian company ICM first produced their kit of the ZIL-131 in 2014, and this masterpiece in plastic has been re-released several times, particularly since the tragic invasion of their country. This truck has been a standard 3.5ton 6x6 truck in Soviet, Russian and Ukrainian use since production started in 1966. The latest boxing of the kit represents the vehicle in Ukrainian colours in 2022, and the decal sheet provides representations of the digital camouflage pattern, which makes painting the model a thousand times easier. In the box we also get the figure set 35753 "To be ahead, to save the life" which consists of three sappers engaged in mine detection and removal, assisted by a specialist dog to sniff out explosives. To bring the set together, there are new sprues with a driver and boxes of mines. This is a coherent 'diorama in a box' with the parts to make a scene, but equally they could be used separately. Each part of the kit shows a great deal of thought. The driver comes with seat cushions to accept his body shape. The mines have separate fuses to allow them to be shown 'safe'. The truck has a full engine and interior, with maximum details in every part, including the chassis and tyre tread. In summary, the combination of accuracy, detail and subject








ICM, UKRAINE KRANKENPANZERWAGEN – Sd.Kfz.251/8 Ausf.A with Military Medical Personnel

This new boxing from ICM brings together two excellent kits that we have seen before, 35113 and 35620, creating the perfect diorama set. The Sd.Kfz.251/8 ambulance version of the ubiquitous halftrack was an attempt to get casualties evacuated from the front

line with a degree of protection. The halftrack could accommodate four stretchers, or a larger number of seated wounded with less serious injuries. The version of halftrack in this case is the Ausf.A and this would be typical for early in WW2. The internal alterations to create the ambulance version results in different hull plates being needed, and the modeller is advised to check which ones are selected and choose the new ones. The figures were released separately, and these are a superb group of three medics working on a wounded soldier. Everything is provided, including the equipment stripped off the casualty, and a range of weapons to scatter around. The quality of the vehicle and the figure set is extremely high, with sharp moulding and precise detail. The halftrack has one-piece tracks which are well detailed but have a little flash. Most details are present, but it does lack the locking mechanism on the rear doors. It comes with two decal options, namely the Eastern Front and North Africa. The figures are not suitable for the desert campaign, but the uniforms are perfect for Europe and Russia up until 1943. The combination of these two ICM kits has provided a great opportunity to make a battlefield scene where the vehicle crew are helping and injured comrade, and putting two outstanding kits together is a great idea. CLS





REVELL, EUROPE **TYPE IXC/40 U190 GERMAN SUBMARINE**

www.revell.de and good retailers everywhere SCALE: 1:144 • MATERIALS: IM, WS • ITEM NO.05167 German submarine U-190 was a Type IXC/40 U-boat of Nazi Germany's Kriegsmarine built for service during World War II. Its keel was laid down on 7th October 1941 by DeSchiMAG AG Weser of Bremen, launched on 8th June 1942 and commissioned on 24th September 1942 with Kapitänleutnant Max Wintermeyer in command. The submarine carried out a total of six war patrols during which it sank two ships. On 6th July 1944 Wintermeyer


was relieved by Oberleutnant zur See Hans-Erwin Reith who commanded the boat for the rest of its career in the Kriegsmarine. On 8th May 1945, U-190 received Reichspräsident Karl Dönitz's order to surrender. The boat met the Canadian frigate HMCS Victoriaville 500 nautical miles off Cape Race, Newfoundland, on 11th May. Having surrendered to the Royal Canadian Navy, the vessel served for two more years as HMCS U-190. After such an infamous operational history, it is perhaps fitting that a model kit is created of this U-boat, and Revell have obliged in the scale of 1:144. It's a new-tool release for 2024 so the engineering is fresh and modern and there are some very nice touches of detail in many places, such as the main and conning tower decking, the rivet-work on the structure of the latter and the deck guns. Somewhat sadly though, there are some clumsy details too, the most apparent of which are the heavy 'panel' lines that criss-cross the hull. Their prominence bears no relation to reality, and are best sanded down by the modeller for a more convincing effect, particularly for the scale of 1:144. Another example of significantly over-scale parts are the guard rails on and around the tower which are too heavy. A set of 3D-printed rails (or photo-etched metal) and some scraping/sanding on the hull will bring this model up to scratch. TMMI





Tamiya offers 1:35 kits of two of the vehicles covered in this latest volume in the invaluable (and reinvigorated) Panzer Tracts series, so prospective builders of those models should seriously consider buying themselves a copy to accompany them on their journey. Both the real-life versions of Tamiya's 'German Panzer IV/70(A)' (kit No.35381) and the 'German Jagdpanzer IV/70(V) Lang' (kit No.35340) from the esteemed 'Military Miniature Series' are examined in



detail here, along with the other variants in this family of Word War Two German tank-hunters. Panzer Tracts comes from highly respected authors Hilary Louis Doyle and Thomas Jentz and the reference material found within – wartime photographs, scale drawings, specification charts, operational histories, detail sketches of the


vehicles' equipment and, naturally, an authoritative accompanying text - makes this book a hard-to-rival source of information, made all the more compelling by the very reasonable price of just £20,












Challenger 2 is due to be upgraded to Challenger 3 in the future. The origin of Challenger, as a radical development of the Chieftain, owes much to an Iranian order for the Shir 2, which never materialised but evolved into Challenger. The book is profusely illustrated, and shows the Challenger in



detail, and in service, with detail shots for modellers and action shots to show the tank in its element. In the Gulf, a Challenger made the longest tank-on-tank kill at 2.9 miles! At the back of the book there are 12 colour profiles to show camouflage patterns and markings, plus a series of multi-view drawings in 1:35. Besides the attention given to the tank itself, the book is full of anecdotes about the crews and wider units, giving a unique sense of life in the troops which manned the Challenger. This aspect adds to the historical treatment of the vehicle, and sets a context for the Challenger which has been the mainstay British MBT for four

decades. The Challenger gets the full treatment from Richard Kent, and the reader will find the book engrossing, whether as a modeller or a military historian. CLS



3D PRINT IS THE WAY FOR SMALL-SCALE MOTORCYCLE SPOKES!

amiya's recently launched 1:35 KS600 (Zündapp) Motorcycle and Sidecar (35384, above) was welcomed with open arms by modellers of military subjects worldwide, and the quality is fantastic. The one limiting factor with injection-moulded motorcycle kits in smaller scales is the gauge of their wheel spokes. They are generally moulded quite thickly to avoid damage during assembly by modellers with less experience, and can look over-scale. For those with a little more experience however, it didn't take long for a couple of aftermarket manufacturers to come to the rescue with 3D-printed sets and here we see a pack of four wheels from Special Hobby (P35031, in pink) and a more extensive set from Sol Models (MM786, in grey) which both include very fine spokes. Sol Models have the edge when it comes to sheer thinness: Special Hobby's spokes are a little


heavier but still look excellent and well within scale parameters. I will be building the KS600 for a full feature in TMMI soon, but I haven't yet chosen which wheel set will be used. What do you think? ●



Tamiya Masking Fluid 20g bottle (87229)

Tamiya has launched a masking fluid that will be ideal for sealing off areas on a model to protect them from the painting process. It is similar in consistency to Mr Hobby Mr Masking Sol R, more like a PVA-based liquid than one with a latex base and thus offers a longer and more precise working time, but with a longer drying time as the corollary. It will be good for masking curved surfaces and complex shapes to which tape will not properly conform and it can be cut once dry with a hobby knife. I can't wait to try it!

Tamiya's 1:72 F-35B joins the 'Scale Warbird Collection' of fighting aircraft

he Lockheed Martin F-35B Lightning II is operated by the Royal Air Force's famous 617 Squadron 'Dambusters', United States Marine Corps, Italian Navy, Italian Air Force, Royal Australian Air Force, Belgian Air Force, Japan Air Self-Defence Force, and the Republic of Singapore Air Force. The kit encompasses all the astonishing detail and accuracy of its bigger 1:48 cousin, a model that was featured back in Tamiya Model Magazine Issue 339, January 2024.

The new version takes in all the design changes for the B-model, most notably that huge intake door behind the cockpit, the inner face of which is often adorned with the flag of the operating nation. Inside that door, Tamiya have recreated an astonishing amount of detail and the same is true of the '3BSM' (3-Bearing Swivel Module) engine exhaust nozzle that can be positioned in the 'hovering' mode. It is

covered in amazing detail and just needs some creative paint work to bring it to life.


Two modes can be chosen by the modeller: hovering, with open intake door, downward-facing exhaust nozzle, extended undercarriage leg struts and scissor-links, and 'landed' mode, which uses a different set of undercarriage parts in the 'compressed' configuration (with closed scissor-links) to depict the aircraft's weight pressing down on the legs: an important observation by Tamiya's designers. This is another wonderful achievement from Tamiya, and an exquisite replica of this extraordinary fighter and one of the best 1:72 kits ever created.



Nissan Fairlady 240Z Street-Custom (Item 24367)


Minds were certainly blown when the first generation (S30) Nissan Fairlady Z debuted in 1969; its sumptuous long nose short deck fastback coupe looks were – and still are - the stuff dreams are made of, and it had stunning performance to match. Then in late 1971 there was a treat for its fans in the Japanese market as the previously export-only 240Z with its 150hp 2.4-liter engine was made available – it was predictably a big hit in Japan too, and customers in the archipelago also had a range of customizing parts to choose from. This assembly kit model recreates such a Fairlady 240Z as it might have been seen on the 1970s streets, with popular customizations of the day.






The front-hinged bonnet opens to show off the 2,393cc inline-6 SOHC engine with triple carburetors and aluminum air funnels.
