AN ALL NEW RS FROM ZUFFENHAUSEN!

Tamiya's newest 1:24 addition to the iconic Sports Car Series takes the form of the muscular Porsche 911 GT3 RS 'Weissach Package'

It has been twenty-three years since Tamiya released the 1:24 Porsche 911 GT3 (24229), so it was about time we had a new RS masterpiece from Zuffenhausen, Stuttgart, in 1:24, of course. The new kit depicts the 2022 '992' car and it sports all the features that differentiate it from lesser 911s in Porsche's line up; DRS rear wing, frontal radiator with hot-air outlets in the front lid, PCCB ceramic brakes and oversize callipers, magnesium Weissach Package wheels plus full bucket-seats and roll cage.

Carbon-fibre features extensively on the exterior and this is replicated with the inclusion of highly convincing composite-effect decals as standard. Three colour options are catered for; Pearl White, Guards Red and Black, with bodyside 'GT3 RS' decals in red, silver, metallic blue and black. The modeller can, of course, choose their own colour and graphics combinations.

The kit is an engineless release, but let's face it, you can't see a lot of the engine in a Porsche 911 anyway, so it's no great loss. The doors, bonnet and boot lids are all moulded closed, which preserves the shut-lines and offers a better scale-like appearance than if they were hinged. An extremely helpful feature is the moulding of all black-painted/carbon-fibre body fittings – bonnet intake edging and grille, front-wing outlets, rear-wing intake liners, wheel-arch splitters, front and rear valances, rooftop winglets – as

individual pieces, thus eliminating some tricky masking jobs and giving the potential for an incredibly neat final appearance.

It's another Tamiya triumph of design intelligence and refined detail, offering the modeller an incredibly satisfying build experience, while eliminating those annoying masking operations than can ruin a paint finish. The racing version next, please! ●










TOBU TAMIYA CONTEST 20



THE FINAL DAYS OF FIGHTING



Rob Herring builds and paints Tamiya's sublime five-figure set of late-war German soldiers and places them in an evocative setting

There is always a buzz in the modelling world when a new kit is announced, and even more so when it's by Tamiya. German subjects are especially popular, so this new set of German Infantry received much attention on various social media sites. What made this set even more interesting was that the figures were late-war infantrymen with several details representing specific clothing and equipment features we would expect to see in North West Europe in 1944/45.

As is now typical of Tamiya, these new figures were produced by 3D scanning of full-size subjects, so have a noticeably natural feel to them. Folds and creases in the uniforms do not look artificial, and the proportions of the figures are obviously spot on, because they are, after all, human! I feel this is the big difference between the 3D scanned figures and digitally sculptured ones. Some digitally produced figures look very artificial and almost robotic in comparison to these.



STEP 1: FIGURE CONSTRUCTION

Before continuing, I'd like to acknowledge the work of master 1:35 figure painters Calvin Tan and Jaume Ortiz. They produce some of the most convincing figures, and over the years have been very generous sharing their methods and knowledge, and have always been happy to answer questions. Calvin especially continues to be a great innovator in this hobby and several methods I have used here are methods he has pioneered, and I have adapted others. Never be afraid to try new things, and never be scared to ask questions.

The most noticeable thing about these figures is that the breakdown of parts is quite different to many plastic figures produced by many manufacturers over the years. Gone are the traditional left/right legs, torso with belt, arms and head that have been here since Airfix Multipose. Here we have front/back tunic, three-quarter legs and with the zeltbahn-clad figures, there are up to five parts to capture the complex folds of this item. What's clever is where the parts join: always disguised along collars, epaulettes, pockets. The figure ambitiously clothed in a zeltbahn over a greatcoat has the greatcoat collar as a separate piece. *[pic 1]*.

The assembled figures and weapons were mounted onto various purpose-made or improvised handles for holding the figures while painting. I used Blu Tack to 'mask' any areas that would be glued later, such as arms or the top of heads. *[pics 2, 3]*. They were then primed using Mr Finishing Surfacer 1500 Black from a spray can and checked for any imperfections.

I used acrylic paints throughout the painting of the figures. I usually use Vallejo Model Color but by an extraordinary stroke of luck, I won a set of Calvin Tan Signature Set of AK Interactive Gen3 paints for WW2 German Uniforms *[pic 4]* at a raffle at a model show! So obviously I used these. So far I have found them more predictable than the Vallejo paints, which sometimes could dry with a slight sheen. However, since painting these figures Vallejo have relaunched their Model Colour range with new formulas, so maybe they're better now.

STEP 2: CREAT

I then had to decide how best to display the figures. Usually I produce single figures on a wooden plinth and I considered doing that with these guys, but the amazing box-art shows the figures work almost perfectly together as a vignette. So I explored how I could do that while telling a story and making the vignette visually interesting.

Five guys on a base could be pretty dull, so what could I do to add to the story? These are late-war Germans – not Volksturm defending Berlin – but regular infantry, clearly tank-hunting given the Panzerfaust and Tellermine. I came up with the idea of having them on a railway, maybe in a station in the suburbs of a German city or town, with a segment of platform. I considered adding ammo boxes, or panzerfaust boxes, but decided to use luggage abandoned by locals as they leave their homes to become refugees.

The tracks came from the excellent European Gauge Railway Track by MiniArt. For a vignette like this I didn't need much and used a razor saw to cut it to shape, once assembled. I kept the offcuts because they can be used on single figure bases in the future *[pics 5, 6]*.

For the station platform I used two thicknesses of styrofoam, cut to shape. I spent some time browsing the internet for German stations and platforms, and although there were plenty, including some great colour photos of someone's trip to East Germany during the 1980s which still had untouched 1940s stations, it was clear they were quite varied in their building style. So I opted to make a brick base by scribing the bricks into the foam, and a concrete-paved platform itself. I gave this some texture by using a stiff brush to supple a white glue and Polyfilla mix,

which then had dry Polyfilla sprinkled on top. This dried quite nicely to create a worn surface that should look good painted **(pic 7)**. The rear of the platform was given a plastic card backing to create a neat and sharp finish. **(pic 8)**.

I attached the track and the platform to the base and then test-positioned the partially-built figures, carefully adjusting their positions until I was happy with them, attempting to, for the most part, to get their feet on the wooden sleepers and not the ballast. Not only would they be easier to attach, I assumed the soldiers would try to walk on the sleepers to make less noise. At this point I took photos so I wouldn't forget where I planned they would go! **(pic 9)**.

I began the base-painting with the ballast. I used various grey tones and pale stone colours from AK's Gen3, thinned with their own acrylic thinner and airbrushed on, building up lighter areas until I was happy with the look **(pic 10)**.


For the sleepers, I used lighter colours to simulate the wood grain of the sleepers, then applied filters to both tone down the wood grain effect, and to age them. I lightened the edges as well. The brickwork was painted using various red brown colours and oranges to paint the individual bricks, and in keeping with my figure painting approach to highlights and shadows, attempted to pick out the upper edges with a highlight colour **(pic 11)**.

I didn't use every item from the MiniArt Luggage Set as I wanted a busy, but not overwhelming platform. All the cases had leather bindings and these were painted using similar colours to the soldier's boots. In addition, the hinges and locks were painted in the same non metallic combination used on the figures plus some were painted with browns and yellows to hopefully represent brass **(pic 12)**.







STEP 3: PAINTING A CONVINCING 'FIELD GREY' UNIFORM

The main clothing worn is the M43 field uniform, a simplified version of the earlier war uniform, principally identified by the lack of pleats on the pockets of the field blouse. The colour of this uniform will vary but officially it was Field Grey. I used AK11425 Field Grey mixed with AK11412 Medium Green in various proportions to create subtle variation between the figures.

The figure was primed, using Mr Finishing Surfacer 1500 Black from an aerosol can (pic 13). The base coat of Field Grey followed (pic 14). Highlights and shading were then applied (pic 15) and then we see the finished figure (pics 16, 17).

STEP 4: SPLITTER-MU CAMOUFLAGE ON A Z

Two of the figures are wearing the zeltbahn 31. This was a triangular shaped shelter quarter that had a variety of uses, one of which was where it was utilised as camouflaged clothing. Both styles of wearing are depicted in the set, and are represented really well.

Here we see the figure in primer, again using Mr Finishing Surfacer 1500 Black (pic 18), then the base colour was applied and highlighted using AK11414 Splittermuster Base and AK11429 Russian Uniform Lights (pic 19).

The second most dominant colour is the brown, which has a blocky geometric shape and is almost continuous. AK11160 Black Green and AK11328 RAL 8012 Rotbraun were mixed to create this tone (pic 20).

The green component only appears as detached geometric shapes. Looking at a flattened zeltbahn the seem to occur in groups of three, partially surrounded by the brown, in several variations. AK11415 Splittermuster Green Spots, not surprisingly, is the perfect colour for these.

The final element of this camouflage are the 'rain drops', which are short lines of green that are vertical in their alignment. However, because of the way the zeltbahn is worn, the angle will change on the arms for the figure with the Panzerfaust. I used AK11410 Dark Green, well thinned, and a fine brush (pic 21).

Once the camouflage was painted, I applied some shadow effects using a very dilute AK11418 Brown Black, in creases and in shadow areas such as under the arms. This is painted in thin glazes, and was initially very difficult to see, but after several layers, a shadow effect was visible (pic 22). Finally, here's the completed figure (pic 23).

FINAL STAGES

As I approached the end of the project, there was something still not right. I wanted this to be set in Germany but how could I demonstrate that? The platform was too small to include a station name, but in the end, while looking at some rubbish that could be on the base with the luggage, I discovered 1:35 newspapers ETA Diorama Accessories. Not only that, these were German newspapers and actually dated! I chose one from 11th March 1945: things were going pretty badly by that time, so a defensive German location was established.

Once cut out, I used a large rounded sculpting tool to press into the newspaper on a soft cutting mat to make it appear less rigid and curled and folded it in half gently. I used very very thin glazes of burnt umber acrylic to age the edges. For placing it on the base, I used it in some “dead space”

towards the front, where the bright hat box had fallen on it from the platform. The vibrant hat box draws the eye into seeing the newspaper, in an otherwise dull wartime scene.

Finally everything was brought together on the base: each figure glued on working from the back to the front, letting each dry before the next one was added. I used black VMS Flexy 5K CA glue for this, giving just enough time to shift their position as needed, but wouldn't be too noticeable if some were visible. But I certainly tried to make sure none was visible. The luggage was glued using PVA, and I kept their positions so that nothing was aligned to the sides of the plinth. After the newspaper was glued down using PVA and dry, the very last thing was to add the hat box! I pushed it around a bit before I found a position I liked, then out came the PVA, and it was done! ●

ONE HELLUV

This is quite simply the best build TMMI has ever seen of a 1:48 F/A-18F Super Hornet.

Marcin Witkowski describes the processes and techniques he used in the creation, over a three-year period, of his Hasegawa masterpiece...



VA HORNET

I started this project with the intention of building a relatively simple model with some additional resin/PE aftermarket parts to avoid too much scratchbuilding, which I generally enjoy. However, I dropped this idea quickly when I decided to add some details that the Hasegawa kit and the Aires set didn't provide. I should note that when I started this project, other Super Hornet kits from Meng or Hobbyboss weren't yet on the market. ▶




● The first stage of the build was to incorporate resin parts such as the nose and main landing gear wells, as well as the cockpit. It was a bit of a challenge because the cockpit part and the front undercarriage bay are adjacent, almost like in the real plane, so I had to sand down the floor of the cockpit and the bay ceiling (pics 1, 2).


An even bigger challenge was reproducing the fuselage skin around the bay because I put the resin part not under the plastic surface, but instead of it. I made new skin using 0.01mm thick high-nickel brass plate. The main landing gear bay resin castings and kit intakes required a lot of milling and sanding in order to place them side by side in the right positions (pic 3).

I made the engine nozzles from scratch to achieve more detailed General Electric F414 components. Everything in this case was in my control, so I decided, upon seeing a picture of the real plane in that rare situation, to open one nozzle and close the second one. This is also a little tribute to my beloved Tomcat. I made the nozzles using plastic sheet for internal feathers and brass plate for outer elements. The burner cans and turbines of the F414 are Aires resin parts (pics 4 to 9).

After fitting the main cockpit part into the fuselage, I noticed that the aircraft I had selected to represent with the model – VFA-103 Jolly Rogers – were equipped in 2007 with a modernized WSO (Weapons Station Officer) suite called ACS. I decided to make the entire sub-element from scratch as the Aires set and kit parts didn't contain this variant. I used Tamiya plastic sheet for the general shape plus some black plastic for the screens. I cut the frames, and I made the displays themselves using green and blue transparent foil instead of painting them. Thanks to this, my screens are perfectly flat (pics 10, 11).



The HUD is always a challenge in scale models because of the fragile construction. I used Aires PE frames, but I wanted the set of two parallel glass sheets to have a holographic effect like in the real plane. To achieve this, I used a fragment of material taken from a CD/DVD.



FOLD THOSE WINGS!
To make my model look more unique and interesting as a carrier-based platform, I chose to fold the wings. The Hasegawa kit only offers unfolded wings, so I had to crosscut it. I scratchbuilt the folding mechanism using brass pipes and metal sheets, also adding some more small parts (pics 14, 15). All wing moving surfaces like flaps, flaperons, pivoting panels and horizontal stabilisers and rudders, I thinned to achieve sharper edges. I also filled traditional panel lines on them, and using CA glue, I made an imitation of sealing tape.

It was very important for me to add some side structures to the flaps, as they are clearly visible when the wings are folded. I put additional work on hinges and wingtip fairings, which I cut out and reconstructed using red and green transparent plastic. Thanks to this, I created navigation lights (pic 16).

The next stage was to addition of details like pitot tubes, AOA probes,

First, working on a smaller part of a damaged disc, I removed the label and the sticker from this aluminium layer. Then, I protected the thin acrylic layer, which is the most important in this process, with Tamiya tape. After this, I sanded and polished a piece of the disc to achieve about 0.2mm of

1mm original disc thickness. The final step was to gently cut out the proper shapes for each part of the glass. When the unmasking was okay, and the fragile iridescent layer was still on the slimmed-down polycarbonate, I could mount it using Ultra Glue to the frames (pics 12, 13).



UHF antennas and air inlets of the fuel dump system at the top of tails. I made all of these out of brass. Probes and antennas I sawed out of brass 1mm plate, and inlets from 0.1mm sheet. I also scratchbuilt position and navigation lights on vertical stabilizers.


At this stage, my Super Hornet was ready to paint. I decided to use the black-basing method instead of the more common pre-shading, which, in my opinion, isn't the best way to reproduce navy jets TPS. I used Mr Color Black Surfacer 1500. For camouflage, I chose MR Paint. These paints are great, already thinned to be sprayed by an airbrush but despite this, I thinned the paints to apply very thin and transparent layers to build colours slowly with more controllable opacity.

I used templates to take some tonal colour and contrast variations before laying final FS36375, F36320, and 363081 greys. When the main colours were done, I used my own PE templates to paint 'NO STEP' signs or

boot marks, which are visible at various places on the plane (pics 17, 18).

The decalling process went smoothly, as the Fighter Town Decals are perfect. To add more lifelike leaks, hand marks, dirt, or touch-ups, I used artistic oils and acrylic pencils. Some other traces I decided to leave until the very end of the build.

Working on the undercarriage was a bit of a challenge because I decided to add many scratchbuilt details, not just wiring or tubing. Other components created for the nose landing gear were the launch bar, scissors, steering system, landing/signal lights and the whole mechanism of closing/opening nose landing gear doors, among others (pics 19, 20, 21). By the way, the complete set of undercarriage doors I built using brass sheets with some styrene parts for internal structure. This method enabled me to create sharp and thin details with mesh panels on the biggest door (pics 22, 23, 24). ◇



MAIN UNDERCARRIAGE

Working on the main landing gear was a little bit easier, but in this case, I decided to remove the support that doesn't exist in the real Super Hornet. This meant I had to mount the gear exactly the same way that Boeing designed it. Fortunately, this operation went well. At the end of this stage, I used perfectly-shaped ResKit resin wheels (**pics 25, 26**).

I couldn't resist replacing the Hornet's 'sting' (arrestor hook) with a scratchbuilt element. The hook from the kit lacked details and missed its kneeling mechanism. The new item I created using brass pipes or copper rod for ending. Also, using metal, I made a new boomerang-shaped device that is near the hook (**pics 27, 28, 29**).










After spending a few months on the underside details, I got back to the top. The canopy required the removal of the seam line, but the more time-consuming work was on the whole internal structure. I used resin and PE parts from the Aires set, but with serious modifications. I added some frames with rivets, wires, seal, aluminium-made mirrors, JHMCS, and other stuff at the rear end shelf. Also, I paid a lot of attention to the place named turtle-deck (**pics 30, 31, 32**).

Behind the WSO seat, I scratchbuilt a completely new set of details like the canopy actuator, video tape recorders wiring, and a lot of other equipment (**pics 33, 34, 35, 36**).


For the SJU-17 ejector seats, I used the Aires resin items but only as a

base. All smaller details I made on my own. For the cushions, I used Magic Sculpt and copper mesh to mould shape and imitate the texture. For all wiring and tubing, I used copper and led wires or stretched sprues. The belts I made using aluminium foil. In the end, each NACES seat contained more than 200 parts (**pics 37, 38**).

From the beginning of the build, I wanted to show the retractable boarding ladder, which is an eye-catching item, but the miniature provided by Hasegawa is poorly detailed. So, I developed and photo-etched my own ladder set and its bay in the leading edge extension. The final effect is very close to the real element (**pics 39, 40**). ◉

WEAPONS PYLONS

To add more accuracy and realism to the pylons, I made the screws (instead of less commonly used fairings) that fasten the ejector racks. Station 2 SUU-80 pylon, I left empty, so I decided to scratch-build the entire BRU-32 adapter and other internal details. Station 10 pylon at the other wing I removed completely, but in the proper place, I did and placed, using brass, lock/mount mechanism item. Looking at pictures of fuel tanks, I noticed a characteristic composite structure. The decision couldn't be other than: let's do it! Using 0.2mm scribe, I did crossing patterns on two tanks (pics 41, 42).

Besides fuel tanks, I chose for my Super Hornet an asymmetrical set of carried weapons, including one piece of AIM-9X, AGM-65, GBU-12, and GBU-38. For two GBUs, I used the main body Mk82 bomb taken from a resin set, but other components I made from scratch.

I put a lot of work into the GBU-12 as it contains retractable wings and a laser on its nose. I did the laser eye using material from the broken car blinker. Forward fins and wings I made of brass. The whole back section with wings cassettes was created using plastic. GBUs-38 fins are also metal-made. For the strike kit mounted on the bomb nose, I used brass foil. Both bombs got an imitation of thermal coat which I made using Ammo MIG Anti Slip Paste. The entire Maverick and its LAU-117 launcher I made scratch-built. ◉





● The missile was born of a flat brass plate, which I rolled up and then soldered to obtain the pipe on proper diameter. I chose this way to create a very detailed nozzle of the missile which contains many elements. The nose is made of plastic, but I put inside a brass pipe which in the end got a laser seeker clear covered by UV glue. Maverick wings I made also of brass, but fins are made of plastic. AIM-9X I borrowed from an excellent Tamiya F-16 kit. The miniature of the Sidewinder is quite accurate and well-detailed, but I decided to add a seeker in the nose, side sensors, and a little thrust vector control (pics 43, 44, 45).

LAST STEPS

The base for the model is a part of the aft elevator of USS Dwight D. Eisenhower, and it is 100% scratchbuilt. I used some Styrofoam and Tamiya plastic sheets that were 0.3 and 0.5mm thick for the deck, which is covered by Ammo Anti-Slip Paste. The pad-eyes are made of stretched sprues, and for the safety fence outside the deck, I used 0.8mm fishing braided line mounted on frames made of Tamiya 3mm diameter profiles. The whole project took me more than three years. ●






HOW BIG IS YOUR... **...CARBON FOOTPRINT?**

Asi Erev returns to TMMI to give Tamiya's 1:24 GMA T.50 the Scale Motorsport full carbon-fibre treatment!






Once again, Matthew Wells from Scale Motorsport contacted me about doing the templates for a 'book match' full carbon jacket on the Tamiya 1:24 Gordon Murray Automotive T.50, I was extremely excited to do it. Matthew sent me the kit and the carbon-fibre sheets and I started working on it as soon as I got the kit. ▶

1 The first thing I did was cut the body parts from the sprues, starting by the outer shell parts, then I cleaned each part and washed them with dish soap. After that I used the Tamiya 40mm masking tape to create the carbon-fibre templates. After the templates were done, I primed each part with Tamiya Grey Surface Primer. After getting perfect results from the primer, I used Tamiya TS-29 Semi Gloss Black which works great when applying Scale Motorsports decals.

After painting the outer shell parts I started applying Scale Motorsports Twill Weave (1020) carbon-fibre decals to the front cowling (nose), which was a very

complicated procedure. The next part I applied carbon-fibre decals to was the door which it comes in two pieces that you must glue together before primer and paint, definitely another 'unique' part to cover with carbon-fibre decal.

Next I moved on to the engine hoods, after I did the rear bumper and other miscellaneous parts related to it. (The rear bumper was very different to most car kits I have done, this one having a fan in the centre which made it a little more complicated to cover with carbon-fibre decal). After that I worked on the rear fenders, the A-pillars, headlights, mirrors and front lower valance.

Moving on to the body shell, and here I need to prime and paint so I could apply carbon-fibre decals to some areas. I placed masking tape on the areas that I would not be carbon-fibering before paint.

DIFFUSER

Next I covered the rear diffuser with carbon-fibre decals, using Scale Motorsport box weave #1820 (1:20) and twill weave #1012 (1:12). Later on, the engine and suspension will be mounted to this part. Then I covered the engine ducts with Hi-Def carbon-fibre #1512HD and the engine intake with

carbon-fibre decals 1:20 Twill Weave. After finishing most of the parts that needs to be covered with carbon-fibre on the outside I moved on to the interior.

The first thing I did was prime and paint the tub, using Splash Light Grey Surfacer #SPP-004 and Semi-Gloss Black #SPM-13. I used my airbrush by Grex with a 0.2mm needle. Then I applied black flocking powder #16000 from Streetblisters to make it look like carpet on the floor. I applied carbon-fibre to the rocker mouldings and a few other

parts in the tub, then turned to the seats. The driver's seat comes in four separate parts, the shell and three pads, which makes it easier to work on. I primed all the seats with Splash Light Grey Surfacer #SPP-004, then for the driver seat I used Semi-Gloss Black #SPM-13, then I covered the shell with twill weave 1020 carbon-fibre decal. I then painted the pads with orange #SPE-01 from Splash Paints, mixed with baby powder to give the textured look. After I applied 1mm black stripe in the centre of the seat pads from Interdecal. I then applied Textured Black from Zero Paints to the passenger seats. ▶



After having applied carbon-fibre decals to rear bumper, the photo-etched parts were dry-fitted before applying the ubiquitous clear coat





Next up was the dash panel and door cards, which I primed and painted, again with Splash Paints materials. The dash panel comes in three separate parts: the top part and the lower part I painted with Textured Black mixed with textured white to make it a little bit greyish. The centre piece and instrument panel was covered with SM Twill Weave #1020. For the steering wheel I used textured black paint, carbon-fibre Twill Weave #1020 and Splash Paint Gun Metal #SPM-04 for miscellaneous details on the dashboard. Then I did the

door panels which come in two separate parts, painting the pad with textured black by Zero Paints and the outer shell covered with carbon-fibre decal #1020.

Next I worked on the engine and suspension parts. I started by priming the engine parts and then used Splash Paints Aluminium #SPM-01 on the engine block and transmission. The valve covers were painted with Orange #SPE-01 by Splash Paints, and I must thank Tamiya for separating the coils from the valve covers it was much easier to paint them in Semi-Gloss Black SPM-13. ◀



After the carbon-fibre decalling of the door cards detail painting, the speaker decal was applied, making it look more realistic. The padded panel was also fitted



I then moved to the exhaust pipes which I primed and then painted in Chrome from Zero Paints ZP-M1000, then on top of this I applied Alclad II Hot Metal Sepia ALC-416. After that I sprayed a thin layer of Transparent Yellow ALC-402 to create a heat-stained look.

Moving on to the suspension most of the parts now, and here I used Splash Paints Aluminium SPM-01, the rotors being painted with Zero Paints Carbon Ceramic Grey #ZP-1319 and the callipers Gold SPM-16 from Splash. It was then time to glue in the seats and some of the interior parts to the tub, followed by the engine parts to the diffuser, which then I fixed to the tub, plus the rest of the suspension as well.



Templates were cut from masking tape so the edges of the clear parts could be painted

Moving on to the clear parts, I created templates and then painted the edges in Semi Gloss Black to make it more realistic. Then it was time to fix the dash panel parts and door panels together, then cement it to the shell. After this, it was time for me to attach the clear parts – comprising the windscreens and door windows – to the shell. Then, time for a clear coat on all the carbon-fibre parts! I used Splash Gloss Clear SP-UC1 for this step.

After everything was dry I fixed the A-pillars, doors, rear fenders and front cowling (nose). Note that I had to glue the headlights

to the nose before that. Then I brought the rear bumper parts together, including the taillights and the photo-etched grilles which came with the kit. When I was done with that, I attached the sub-assembly to the outer shell then took the tub and attached it to the outer shell.

FINAL STAGES

For the wheels I used 3D print GW-27XLTP CM5-RS type wheel from Geronimoworks, I painted the tyres with Splash Rubber Black #SPM-17 and the wheels with Splash Gun Metal #SPM-04. Then I attached

them to the car, also I fitting the wiper and the mirrors at the same time. It was finally time for me to attach the clear parts to the engine hood which Tamiya gives you the option of open or closed: I will probably leave it open so you can see the details on the engine.

Once again, Scale Motorsport's amazing carbon-fibre decals have transformed an already superb Tamiya car kit into something truly special, and you can have a go at it yourself, because the template set you see here will soon be available to purchase from Scale Motorsport. ●

Tamiya's Renault 5 Turbo returns! FLY ME TO THE HOON!

From its 1972 debut, the Renault 5 proved to be a massive success. In 1981 there appeared a special and rather different version of the car in the form of the Renault 5 Turbo, intended to run in rally races worldwide. The rear seats were removed and replaced with a midship-mounted 160hp 1.4-litre straight-four petrol engine that was paired with a turbocharger and fuel injection technology. This provided a top speed of 200km/h and an impressive 0-400m time of just fifteen seconds!

Renault were not satisfied with simply changing the engine, though, giving the '5 Turbo double wishbone suspension and ventilated brake discs. The body was also updated and had prominent over-fenders; its use of aluminium roof and doors, as well as plastic bonnet and fenders meant that the car weighed in at a mere 910kg. Inside the car was a dashboard with no less than ten different dials and plenty of leather. A cult-classic was born.

Tamiya's kit dates back to 1982 and its very welcome 2024 re-release retains all the charm of that edition; a quick and straightforward assembly, ratchet front steering, a highly accurate bodyshell profile and, of course, a driver figure. It comes with the original's tyre sizes front and rear (bigger at the back, smaller at the rear), chromed wheels plus the funky body graphics. What's not to love? ●


A LOT LESS BOVVER WITH A

The Patrol Air Cushion Vehicle (PACV), also known as the Air Cushion Vehicle (ACV) in Army and Coast Guard service, was a United States Navy and Army hovercraft used as a patrol boat in marshy and riverine areas during the Vietnam War between 1966 and 1970. Six hovercraft were built,

three for the Army and three for the Navy. The PACV was based on the Bell Aerosystems SK-5 hovercraft; a licensed version of the British Saunders-Roe (later, British Hovercraft Corporation) SR.N5 hovercraft. The SK-5 was adapted for American military use in 1965. (History edited from Wikipedia).

Gecko Models have been tempting the modelling community with this release for many months, and now a sample has arrived for review in TMMI! The kit box is big as you would imagine, containing twenty-seven sprues in grey polystyrene for the main structures, black plastic for the 'inflatable' skirt and one in clear for the windows. A modestly-sized photo-etched brass fret provides seat harnesses and other fittings, and there's a stretcher formed from caramel-coloured 3D-print resin. A sheet of decals provides markings to build one of four examples, all with that sinister, toothy grin (three slightly different styles) plus different coloured eyes.

The very first thing to note about Gecko's PACV kit is that it is provided with its side-skirts in a state of 'inflation' (ie, engine running and ready to move) so one's only option is this

mode, the slight issue being, that a PACV with its throttles open was very unlikely to not have had a pilot at the helm, but none is provided in the kit. So, the modeller will have to adapt an existing figure (a 1:35 helicopter pilot would probably be most appropriate) and place him at the controls, for an authentic appearance. Alternatively, the more enterprising modeller may wish to design and 3D-print their own deflated skirt, which would offer more diorama possibilities but requiring, of course, the equipment and skills for such an endeavour.

But back to the kit, and wow, it is an impressive production. the upper hull is a one-piece moulding of around 275mm in length plus a lower skirt tub of around 285mm in length. The cabin interior builds up on a flat plate and is full of superb details; lightweight,

helicopter-style seats, ammunition boxes, control panel, radar set and more. In terms of design, think of the interior of an oversize UH-1 chopper and you're in the right ballpark.

Behind the cabin is the huge fan intake that inflates the skirt and there's some neat shutter and guide-vane detailing here too. Sitting atop the cabin roof is a gun tub much like the type fitted to the Pibber patrol boat, with a pair of M2 .50cal HMGs and a tiny gunner's seat. Directly behind this turret (I hope the gunner had ear-defenders) sits the central 'pod' for the General Electric 7LM100-PJ102 gas turbine engine, its intake a foot from the gunner's head... No engine detail is provided, but with so much else going on across the PACV's exterior areas, there's more than enough to look at.

Detail is stunning, with lines of very fine raised rivets on the main structures and as it's a Gecko Models production, there are a lot of small parts to be fitted to the exterior.

Having said this, the overall assembly of the model is quite straightforward and should not take the competent modeller too long to bring it all together. The PACV will come to life with the painting and weathering stages (plus the addition of a crew; minimum one) and that is exactly what we plan to do! So, keep reading TMMI to see this beauty built and painted in all its glory! www.tamiyamodel-magazine.com ●

Tamiya's journey with the Fiat 500 started all the way back in 1996, with the release of the road car kit, which was – and still is – a little gem of a model. Then, ten years later, the kit was revised in order to create the 'Abarth' racing edition, which meant the inclusion of wheel-arch extensions, bucket seats, racing wheels, new engine parts, a solid panel to replace the sunroof and a racing steering-wheel. The decal sheet included two sets of markings for sports versions, one with a bold red stripe for the upper sides of the body, the other featuring lower bands of red and white and a groovy black and white checker-pattern roof panel and a red 'Scorpione' emblem for the bonnet. Both look superb, so it's probably best to buy a two of these kits so you can have one of each scheme in your display case... The model comes with photo-etched, chrome-plated and self-adhesive Abarth badges which will add a touch of high-definition sparkle to the finished model. To help in the painting of the window surrounds, a sheet of pre-cut, self-adhesive masks is also included in the box. Even though the model is the thick end of thirty years old (!) the detail is pure Tamiya magic, all but indistinguishable from more recent 1:24 car releases, such was the level of sophistication back then, and still now of course. Tamiya's designers captured the Cinquecento's cuddly body profile to perfection, a shape amplified by the bulging wheel arches and chunky racing tyres of the Abarth edition, making it completely irresistible! **TMMI**

Katana. What more needs to be said? Arguably the most instantly recognisable motorcycle design ever, Suzuki's 1,100cc beast, launched in 1981, must have featured in thousands of posters, Blu-Tacked to youngsters' bedroom walls the world over. Tamiya cottoned on quickly to this two-wheeled zeitgeist and released models in 1:6 and 1:12 of the bike, which were instantly snapped up by modellers and bikers alike, to be displayed in cabinets and mantelpieces and admired by all. Tamiya's 1983 1:12 kit was recently re-issued to the delight of model makers of all disciplines (and all at TMMI), its elegantly simple colour scheme and zig-zag fuel tank/seat/rear cowling proving impossible to resist. And given its forty+ year vintage, the model can still hold its head up against much more recent motorcycle kits, featuring sophisticated design, pin-sharp detail and a helpful, logical assembly sequence. The box contains three sprues in metallic grey (frame, engine, fuel tank, wheels, chain, seat, front forks) and one each in black injection-moulded polystyrene (exhausts, mirrors), chrome (front forks, engine panels) and clear (windscreen, lights, indicators). The tyres carry perfect tread detail and are superb replicas of the real things; they even smell great! A roll of vinyl tubing is supplied for the ignition lines, throttle, clutch-cable and brake-cables and a sheet of waterslide transfers provides fuel-tank logos, dial decals, Katana emblems and data placards. A packet of micro-screws that hold together the main sub-assemblies completes the package, and it is an extremely attractive package too, particularly for those of us who had Suzuki Katana posters on our bedroom walls! **TMMI**





The M3 light tank evolved at the end of the 1930's and mounted an adequate gun for the period. In addition, it was fast, cheap and reliable, making it a useful addition to the US armoured units. This kit represents a tank from the initial production batches, with a riveted turret which was rapidly replaced by welded types. The early tanks had no fewer than four machine guns and the Stuart looked very formidable. This initial version was used by the US 1st and 2nd Armored Divisions in their training in the South Carolina, forming the nucleus of the formations that would become so successful. The initial M3 Stuart tanks were also sent in small numbers to the British for evaluation, though they were adapted before being used in action. The kit provides the turret interior components, but this particular boxing does not offer the hull interior or engine that is found in kit #35401. This latest release provides everything for making a superbly accurate model with none of the problems of kits from some other manufacturers. The MiniArt offering is extremely detailed and the moulding is crisp, with no flaws. The tracks are provided as link-and-length, which certainly saves a lot of time and assembly of this little tank is trouble free. The paint options (Olive Drab!) are limited, but the pre-war US markings are very colourful and the end result is a very attractive model. **CLS**




In WW2, the unique German 8-wheel armoured cars were a significant part of their recce units, being able to carry out exploratory armed probing of Allied positions. The first series of cars proved to be very successful in all types of terrain, moving quickly and able to force their way through lightly held positions. However, they were replaced by the heavier Sd.Kfz.234 series, which came in four variants, the Puma being the turreted version with a 5cm anti-tank gun. About 100 of these Pumas were produced from 1944 onwards, serving with the Panzer Divisions on the Eastern Front and in North-West Europe. This incredibly attractive vehicle has appeared many times in kit form and MiniArt have released their kit in two versions, with or without a full interior. This particular kit (35419) is the kit without the interior items and to be honest the hatches are so small that nothing can be seen in the hull! As with all recent MiniArt releases, this kit is absolutely sensational, with easy construction and very fine detail. In fact, this kit is noteworthy in that the build has been simplified without losing any of the precision that modellers are looking for. The external stowage is complete and the instructions make clear where different parts are needed for the six decal options provided. The use of etched brass has been kept to a minimum, so that this eye-catching Puma can easily be assembled without frustrations and the end result is stunning. **CLS**

The Sturmgeschütz was an iconic German vehicle that played a prominent role throughout WW2.

As the war progressed and the Axis forces were faced with a deteriorating situation, the use of Stugs for defensive battles became central to stemming the advance of their enemies. The Stug Ausf.G was the final version and the version in this latest release from MiniArt represents a type that was in action from the end of 1943 until the last days of the war. The noteworthy features of this kit are the saukopf mantlet and the schürzen armour at the side – provided in etched brass. The kit has a full interior, which on a Stug is only visible through the two hatches. A full engine bay is also provided and with all of the access hatches open, a fair amount of the parts are in sight. The exterior is everything we expect from MiniArt, with excellent detail and specific stowage for each of the four decal options provided. The level of detail is enhanced with lots of tiny parts, including optional replacements in etched brass, so that the final effect is simply astonishing. The tracks come in fine individual links, with no sign of flash and which can be assembled to incorporate a little sag as desired. The decal options are quite limited at this point in the war, with crosses and some unit badges, but the painting options are more varied, with quite dramatic camouflage patterns. Overall, this Stug stands out from the many other kits on the market by virtue of the full interior which is sadly hard to appreciate when the model is assembled! **CLS**




The 'Hetzer' (not an official name) is a familiar vehicle from the later part of WW2, when the Germans mass-produced this little Czech vehicle as a lightly armoured

way to get the powerful 7.5cm gun into action. Often serving with Infantry Divisions, the Jagdpanzer 38(t) was a common sight in NW Europe and on the Eastern Front with 2600 built from July 1944 onwards.

A small number were equipped as Command Versions, with additional long-range radio equipment. Of these, in the winter 1944-45, some were fitted with wider tracks to help them cope with snow conditions. This kit by Takom represents one of these vehicles, but with different tracks, or leaving out the additional radio, it could be made as a standard Hetzer. What is remarkable about Takom's kit is the full interior. Within the cramped interior of this little vehicle, Takom have provided a full engine and transmission, plus a full crew compartment with everything in place – ammunition, gun, seats, stowage – it is hard to imagine how the crew fitted inside! The quality of moulding is extremely high and the detail is very precise. The exterior detail is as good as on any Jagdpanzer 38(t) on the market and the interior – sadly mostly hidden – is what makes this kit stand out. An optional clear plastic roof helps a bit. The Winterketten tracks are provided as link-and-length which saves a lot of time in construction, but arguably removes the chance to articulate the suspension. A fantastic kit, but the small hatches prevent so much from being appreciated! **CLS**





This slim twenty-eight-page booklet from MMP Books is No.9 in their Single Vehicle series and is devoted to the Sokol (Falcon) motorcycle which saw a large amount of use leading up to the invasion of Poland in 1939. Categorised as 'heavy', this machine was a real beast, designed to be rugged and powerful, but crudely built and simple to maintain. Widely employed for reconnaissance and often armed with a machine gun, the Sokol was frequently to be seen wherever the army was operating. The book provides a basic history of the type, numerous photos, and scale drawings. For clarity, the 1:35 drawings are also given in double size. At the back of the book, colour plates show example appearances in the original black paint and in army green. The M111 Sokol 1000 is available in couple of resin kits, and hopefully it will be released in plastic at some stage – the 'Falcon' deserves to be recognised more widely! **CLS**




ROMANIAN ARMORED FORCES IN WORLD WAR II

Of the combatant nations swept up in WW2, the Romanians were generally marginalised, and their contribution to the Axis cause is barely recognised. In fact, with limited resources, the Romanian army fought well with the inadequate weapons at their disposal. The armoured units struggled against the Soviet forces that outnumbered them, and had much more advanced vehicles. The Romanian forces fought in Odessa, Crimea and Stalingrad – being virtually decimated by the end of these battles.

Withdrawn to their homeland,

the Romanian forces switched sides as the Soviet forces swept through, and after the war the soldiers were largely interned. This book provides some balance to the lack of information about the Romanian armoured forces, with photos, maps and artwork to illustrate the units and where they fought. By virtue of its rarity, this Kagero publication is a valuable resource, because modellers will appreciate being able to make, for example, their French R35 or German Stug in unusual Romanian markings, which are quite striking. An excellent book on a neglected topic. **CLS**






TAMIYA'S 1:72 F-35B: A LOVELY LITTLE LIGHTNING!

Tamiya's 1:72 F-35B joins the 'Scale Warbird Collection' of fighting aircraft

The Lockheed Martin F-35B Lightning II is operated by the Royal Air Force's famous 617 Squadron 'Dambusters', United States Marine Corps, Italian Navy, Italian Air Force, Royal Australian Air Force, Belgian Air Force, Japan Air Self-Defence Force, and the Republic of Singapore Air Force. The kit encompasses all the astonishing detail and accuracy of its bigger 1:48 cousin, a model that was featured back in Tamiya Model Magazine Issue 339, January 2024.

The new version takes in all the design changes for the B-model, most notably that huge intake door behind the cockpit, the inner face of which is often adorned with the flag of the operating nation. Inside that door, Tamiya have recreated an astonishing amount of detail and the same is true of the '3BSM' (3-Bearing Swivel Module) engine exhaust nozzle that can be positioned in the 'hovering' mode. It is

covered in amazing detail and just needs some creative paint work to bring it to life.

Two modes can be chosen by the modeller: hovering, with open intake door, downward-facing exhaust nozzle, extended undercarriage leg struts and scissor-links, and 'landed' mode, which uses a different set of undercarriage parts in the 'compressed' configuration (with closed scissor-links) to depict the aircraft's weight pressing down on the legs: an important observation by Tamiya's designers. This is another wonderful achievement from Tamiya, and an exquisite replica of this extraordinary fighter and one of the best 1:72 kits ever created. ●


