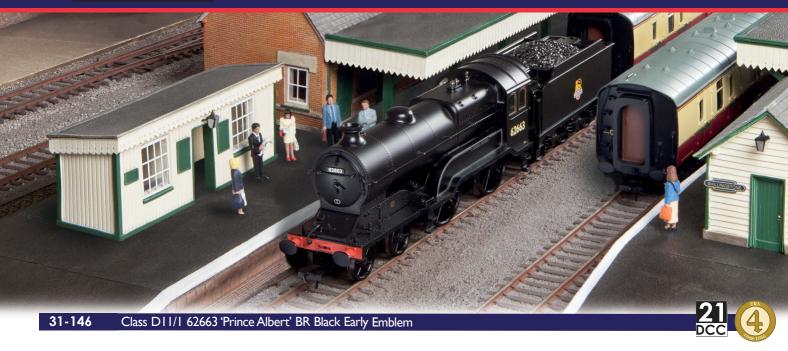

Layout Focus

t is now just over ten years since Hungerford first appeared on the exhibition circuit. In this article, as well as providing the traditional description of the layout, we thought it might be of interest to readers to look back at our experiences exhibiting and to highlight some of the changes that have occurred over that time.

The model is the last of a trilogy of privately funded Great Western 4mm scale exhibition layouts built by a team of Wakefield RMS members, then headed up by prolific modeller Mike Bradley. Their previous layouts were Ceiriog Valley, built in OO gauge and exhibited in the late '70s and Kingsbridge, their first venture into EM gauge, exhibited in the 1980s.

Mike had already built a considerable amount of stock, much of which had run on both of the previous layouts. He now wanted a layout more suited to the main line passenger stock and express engines he had now assembled. Mike was very aware that the public in general want to see trains running, and as many as possible, so he laid down the criteria that the layout should consist of both a double track main line and a station with a goods yard that could be shunted in order to hold the public's attention between main line trains. Hungerford station was chosen purely on the basis that it was an attractive location that met the required criteria.

Our model is of the station and its environs in the period between 1928 and 1935. The sweeping alignment of the new main line, the widened High Street bridge, Up line station building and signal boxes contrasting with the older building on the realigned Down line platform and the even older broad gauge goods shed. The track plan was slightly compromised to fit the available space and some of the

buildings between the station and the High Street have been shortened or omitted, but all the buildings associated with the station itself are accurately represented.

Setting a period

The layout was 20 years in the making and by the time Frank joined the team in 1990 the original team had dwindled to just two members. Mike Bradlev and Mike Evans. By now the boards were built and most of the track had been laid, but not much else. Mike Bradley had continued to build stock at home and he had by then accumulated sufficient to populate the layout, although much of it was still to be tested under exhibition conditions (more of that later). Progress remained slow and by 1997, when Mike Bradley died, there was still the majority of the scenic work to do.

A new team of Wakefield club members was formed around Mike Evans, generously assisted by two friends from North Wales, Malcolm Genner and Reg Howe, who contributed some of the major buildings fronting the High Street, the gardens, the canal barges and the semaphore signals. The final member of the team, Russell Whitwam, arrived soon after Mike's death. Much of the credit for the fine detail on the layout must go to Russell who provided many of the finishing touches. As well as assisting Frank with the wire fencing Russell also provided the point rodding, the working ground signals and all the weeds.

When it came to wiring the layout Mike Evans had his own unique approach perfected on the previous two layouts. Old fashioned by today's standards, many features of the electrical operation moved away from contemporary practice.

Hungerford has been organised into three

distinct sections - an Up line, a Down line, and the goods yard, each of which will never have more than one train moving. Each section is normally connected to their own controller. Where a train is required to cross between sections electrical continuity is achieved automatically as the points are changed, either by the extra contacts on the point motors and/ or by relays operated by the points.

Exhibiting Hungerford

The first exhibition was a near disaster for us. This was only the second time that the layout had been fully erected and much of the rolling stock had never been used in anger, and in particular the locomotives had not been tested under exhibition conditions. Locomotives were



typically of 1960's heritage, white metal construction with milled brass chassis, open framed motors and Romford 40:1 gears as standard. One by one under exhibition conditions the locomotives began to fail because the brass gears were stripping under the strain of pulling heavy trains at speed around such a large layout.

As a result we spent the next two years resolving the motive power issues. As well as the problems with the gears, because of the length of time taken to build the layout, the locos were already showing their age. By now Messers Mitchell and Finney had set new standards in model locomotive construction and the white metal kits of the 1960s were poor relations by comparison particularly below the

footplate. In the longer term it would be possible to substitute models from this new source but in the interim and because we had to dismantle the original chassis anyway, we decided to upgrade several of Mike's locomotives with replacements from the Perseverance range where available, or scratch built, where not. These models now benefitted from Portescap power units, compensation, replacement wheels, American or split-frame current collection, detailed brake gear and sand pipes. These modifications have proven highly beneficial and whilst close scrutiny still reveals the short comings due to their lineage, from a distance these models look the part and most are still giving reliable service.

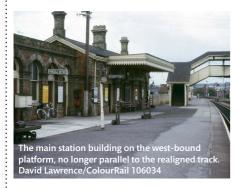
Ten years on we have supplemented the

THE WAY TO THE WEST

Hungerford, a small market town in Berkshire, was first connected to the railway network by a broad gauge branch from Reading in 1847. The line was extended westwards to Westbury in 1862 and in 1906 was substantially upgraded to form the Great Western Railway's main line direct to the west county. Evidence of each of these periods in the station's history could be seen until the 1960s when demolition of the station and many of the buildings near to the railway started, rebuilding of the area continuing until very recently.

KEY DETAILS Prototype modelling - the real Hungerford Station





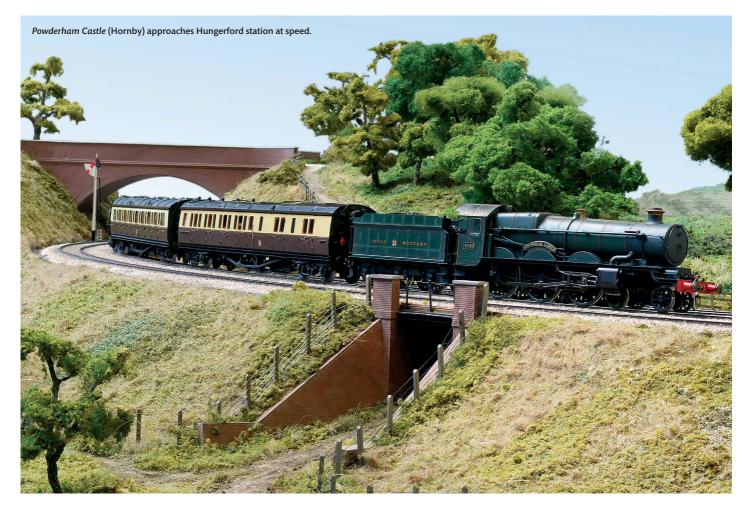

locomotive fleet with several Mitchell and Finney models and more recently a Hornby 'Castle', the only modification to it being new wheel sets and some light weathering. How the hobby has changed!

There is a Cuckoo in the nest in the shape of an Airfix City of Truro bought for 10/6 in the 1960s but not, until more recently, built. Whilst no attempt has been made to correct dimensional anomalies considerable detailing has been added and to the uninformed the model is quite acceptable and built at a fraction of the cost.

A lesson learnt at those early exhibitions was just how much time it took to set up the layout. In the early days of exhibiting It was taking three hours to unpack the stock because of the three-link couplings then used as standard. The time to unpack has been considerably reduced by replacing the original goods stock with stock utilising Alex Jackson couplings. This has had the added advantage of enabling us to install uncoupling magnets in the goods yard so that we can now shunt 'hands free'.

Alex Jackson couplings

There is considerable controversy around the reliability and robustness of Alex Jackson couplings. Our experience has been very positive and we rarely have problems. There are several proprietary jigs available to assist with bending and installing the fine guitar wire used for these couplings, and once installed there is little evidence to suggest that they are easily damaged. In our experience they just spring out of the way when knocked. On the rare occasion a new coupling proves to be unreliable it is discarded and a replacement installed before the next exhibition.

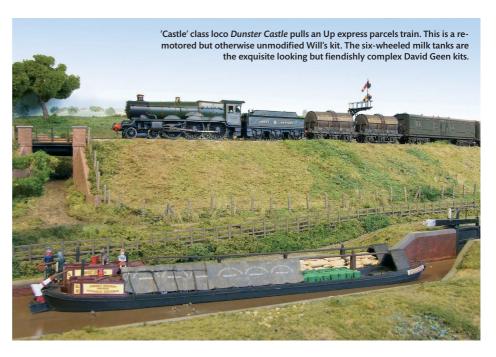
As well as replacing much of the goods stock, Russell has also been busy building replacement parcels vehicles and he has also built several horse boxes. Hungerford had a lot of horse traffic due to the nearby Newbury Races. We are now able to pick up and drop off horse boxes in the horse dock adding to the operational interest.

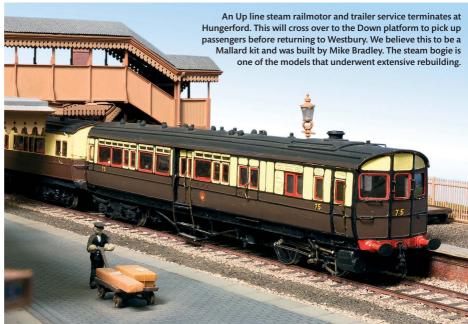
The coaching stock in the main remains unchanged. Mike Bradley was particularly skilled at producing coaches, much of which have been built from either BSL pressed aluminium or Mallard etched-brass kits.

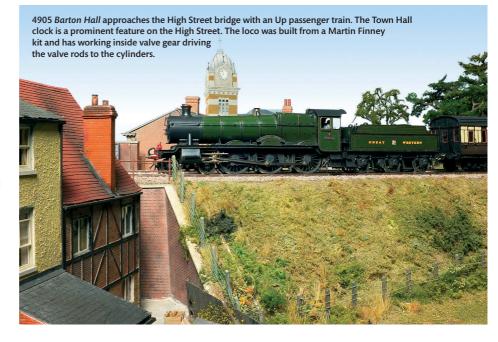
The layout itself has seen considerable change since it was first exhibited. Working ground signals were an early addition. The level crossing has also been animated and was itself the subject of an article in the September 2007 issue of BRM. Much of the ground behind the main line at the canal end has been completely rebuilt and Russell has spent many hours 'growing' weeds all over the layout. Meanwhile Mike has been adding ever more detail to the station buildings and signal boxes but has recently admitted that close scrutiny of the timetable on the Down line station building will reveal that it is in fact a reproduction of the Up line time table! Recently the layout has acquired a new and final building, the wood panelled shed next to the station pub.

Recent changes

We have also gone digital. Several years ago Frank saw a demonstration of DCC at Scaleforum North. He was really impressed by the exceptional slow running achieved and

immediately determined that the goods yard should be converted to DCC control. Mike was less impressed because it fell to him to make the necessary changes in order to completely isolate the goods yard from the main line's common return system. When driving trains in and out of the yard the DCC is now automatically disabled and the yard connected to the appropriate main line controller. Thanks to Mike's ingenuity all the switching is controlled by the points and so has not added any complexity to the operation of the layout.

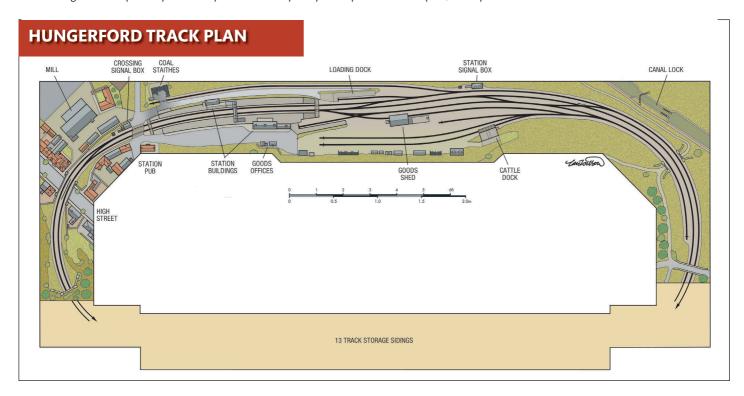
The biggest change of all however had nothing to do with the layout itself or its rolling stock. As mentioned at the beginning of the article Hungerford is a privately funded layout

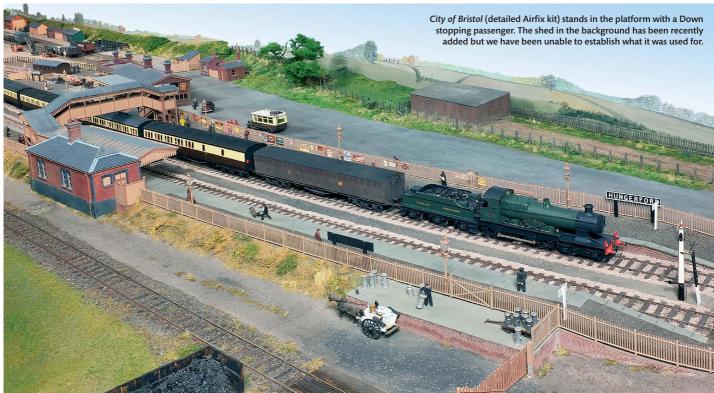
and in 2007 the Wakefield club needed the space then used for storing the layout for a new project. We couldn't store the layout in any of our homes and investigations into the practicalities of using commercial storage proved unrealistic. We were suddenly faced with the unimaginable possibility that we might have to dispose of the layout. We are therefore enormously grateful to the Shipley club for offering us a new home and we have made many new friends as a result.

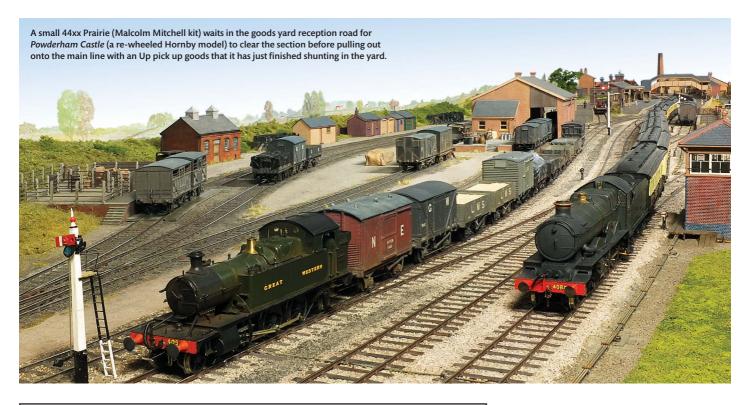
So what of the future? All in all we believe the layout is in many ways better now than when first exhibited, but sadly the exhibition invites are drying up. Big layouts are their own worst enemy. They are expensive to transport, take up

a lot of space, and there are more operators requiring accommodation overnight. It is only the major shows that can afford to invite them and in the current economic climate this is becoming ever more the case.

We have now attended most of the exhibitions available to us. It struck us whilst writing this article that despite the many thousands of hours invested in building the layout and rolling stock, in its entire life time the layout has been operated over less than 60 days, and much of the replacement stock has run considerably less than this. At the time of writing we only have two more confirmed invitations, the Shipley show in September, and Newcastle in 2015.

Mike has already retired and Frank is close behind him. They are both looking at the possibility of building a suitable home for the layout where it can be erected permanently but as yet this remains a pipe dream. We can only hope the opportunities to exhibit Hungerford will continue but only time will tell.

We must not forget the many friends who have made it possible to bring the layout to the public. As well as those friends who have helped build the layout over two decades, we must also thank the many friends who have taken time off work and sacrificed their weekends so that Hungerford could be exhibited as far distant as Southampton and Perth and many places in between.

The future...

Will we build a new layout? Well - yes, we have just started the next and probably final project for some of us, but it will not be Great Western and instead will be an EM gauge model of a local Bradford station - Clayton on the Great Northern line that famously joined Bradford to Halifax and Keighley with a triangular station at the summit of the line at Queensbury. The goods stock from Hungerford can in the main be reused on this new club layout but nothing else is suitable.

How long this will take, who knows? The Clayton project team has been strengthened considerably by several members of the recently completed club layout Leicester South (GC). We are pleased to say the project is attracting some promising younger members keen to stretch themselves to achieve the standards that are expected of fine scale layouts such as we intend this to be. So if not with Hungerford, eventually we will be out again with Clayton when we can start the whole cycle again.

HOW TO... MODEL A CAMPSITE



Practical BRV

his sort of scene makes a great space filler as it can be adapted to fit an odd shaped corner of a layout. Our effort is one foot wide and ten inches deep and it uses around two thirds of the trees and barely touched the packet of grass that feature as this month's magazine subscription offer (see page 27 for more details). You could adapt the ideas to fit the space available on your model by adding more trees, grass and camping accessories to suit.

Grass and trees

The applicator for the grass fibres is a polythene puffer bottle. It's an excellent tool and even if you decide you like the effect enough to buy an electronic grasser, it still has a place in the toolbox.

All methods of applying fibres involve giving them a small electric charge. Because the bottle is made of polythene, if you give it a shake before puffing, static electricity is generated and your grass should still stand up if you puff it on to tacky glue. For the best effect,

let it dry and then suck the excess into a vacuum cleaner. We didn't do this as the undergrowth beneath a tree tends to be a bit flat naturally and if it isn't, children playing under there will quickly do the job.

The trees are the type often described as 'bottlebrush'. To make them, the factory places bristles in a wire loop and then twists this to give the tree shape. It's pretty effective for pine trees but works less well for deciduous types. The trick is to use them in a clump and the eye doesn't notice the lack of detail, especially if the forest is at the back of the layout.

Stay clean!

All this is simple and great fun, if a little messy. Put plenty of newspaper down while you work and lock locomotives and other rolling stock away. Scenic modelling isn't about perfect, neat edges. On this, for example, the grass fibres found their way on to the flock but it looks better than if there had been a hard edge between the two colours, at least that's our excuse for leaving it alone!

You could just as easily make a park using the same techniques – just put a climbing frame and see-saw instead of tents. If that doesn't appeal, how about a sports field with some goalposts? You're only limited by your imagination!

The Faller Camping set contains a couple of frame tents, two gazebos and a selection of smaller tents plus tables and chairs. Not all the components are used from the sprues as there are some caravan parts which will go in the spares box.



Our campsite road is made from a Geoscenics pothole road kit. The powder is sprinkled on to wet PVA and patted down to achieve a reasonably smooth surface.



Straight from the packet, the trees colours are nice enough but perhaps a bit uniform. A quick squirt of cheap hairspray followed by a sprinkle of . Woodland Scenics blended turf bulks the foliage up a bit as well as providing colour variation.



We built up the ground a little with some ready-mixed DIY wall filler. No need for hills, just make the board look a little less flat.



On a permanent layout you could just stick the trees down but as our baseboard will be moved around, we drilled holes in the bottom of the trunk and pushed a piece of cocktail stick in. This fits in holes drilled in the board and anchors them firmly.



The trees were glued down with PVA and then bedded in with a sloppy mix of PVA, powdered wall filler and brown emulsion paint. The paint is also smeared over the roots. This will hide any gaps and bond them to the landscape.



Mown areas such as where the tents will be pitched were sprinkled with blended turf scatter.



At first the grass looks luminous. Don't worry, the colour calms down once the white glue dries clear.



The plastic tents make up easily with Humbrol 'Precision Poly'. The larger ones are pre-painted too. The small ridge tents were painted otherwise there is a lot of blue and yellow on display.



Using the static grass is simplicity itself. Half fill the puffer bottle with fibres, give it a shake with the lid on and then puff grass everywhere you want it.



Unpainted plastic doesn't look like tent material but if you give it a spray of matt varnish the effect is a lot better.



After gluing the tents down with PVA, they need to be fitted with guy ropes. Peco IL-13 track spikes make excellent tent pegs, although track pins would work just as well. If they are too long then a pair of big wire cutters will shorten them.

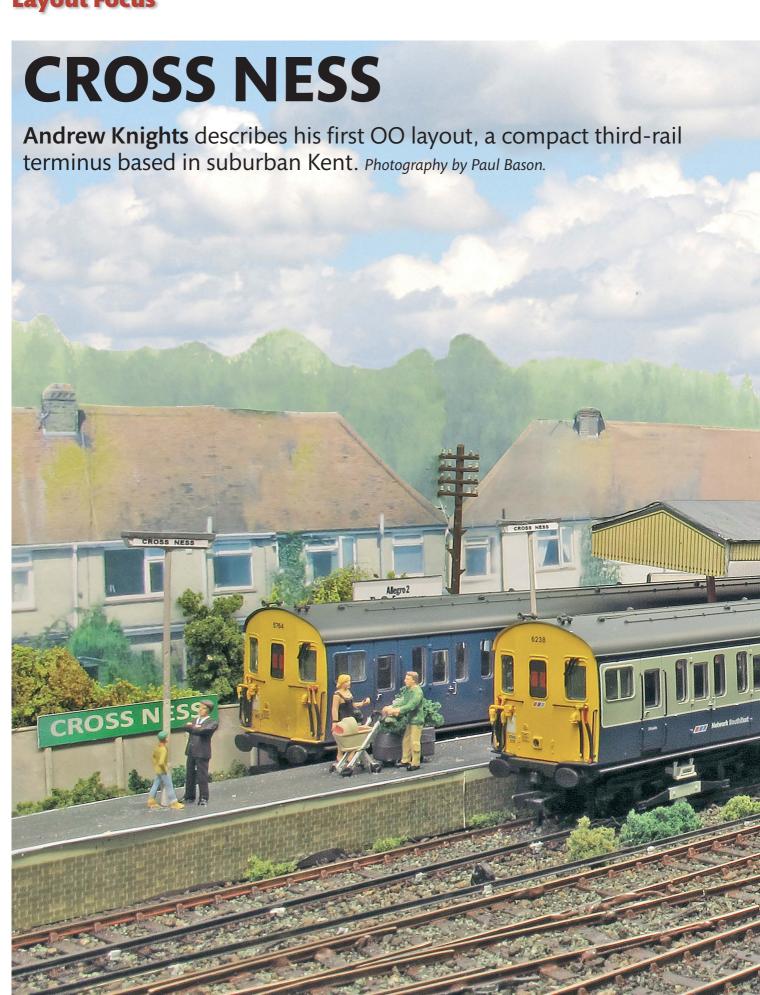

Layout Focus

his layout stems from my college days spent in and around Woolwich for some four years. Some of this time was spent on suburban trains in and around London, or watching trains trundle out towards Kent from various urban canyons within Woolwich. When Bachmann recently brought out their model of the 2-EPB those memories came flooding back, and when they added the refurbished units to their list, I added them to mine too as the refurbished units came in just about the time of my final year. With four units now sitting in the stock box something had to be done.

Back to the present, and I was sitting in the office and happened to notice that on the OS map for that part of the world, there was a long straight diagonal line heading north east from Abbey Wood to the shores of the Thames marked 'Disused Railway'. This aroused my curiosity - could it be a railway? It headed directly for the large sewage works to the East of Cross Ness. Discussion followed and it turned out that what was marked was the embanked high level sewer constructed around the end of

the 19th century. Still, this would make a splendid basis for a railway - but a railway for what and why? Then a friend turned up quite a bit of information on this area for me and amongst this was an engraving from *The Illustrated London News*. It showed work on the sewer, the new road on one side and on the other a tramway. Further research showed that the railway existed for a little while after construction was complete and, in part up until the late 1980s.

A sewage works would not be the most exciting line and would hardly employ four 2-EPBs. This was when the town of Cross Ness was invented. Sorry Thamesmead, you will have to go as will the sewage works. Moved a little to the right perhaps?

A little history

Work started on Cross Ness, a town to house higher ranking workers at the Royal Arsenal, in the 1890s. Victorian villas were built and a tramway was used to ferry-in materials. A transhipment yard was constructed at Abbey Wood station, just to the north east. After

building was complete the line was upgraded to accommodate a shuttle service for workers. All was quiet, until the post WWI building boom. Metroland was being developed to the north of London and Dagenham was growing to the east, but Cross Ness? Speculative building took hold in the 1930s and the line's traffic grew. Many more of those passengers wished to travel into the capital. A London facing junction helped greatly here - no simple shuttle. The coming of electrification saw through services to one of the smaller London termini running Monday to Friday, the London terminus being closed at weekends. This was the pattern of life on the line until closure at the end of the 1990s

Pre-closure some other changes affected the line. Signalling modernisation which resulted in the London Bridge Power Box meant that Cross Ness lost its working signal box, semaphore signals and many station staff. The adjacent quayside changed role. Barges no longer stopped at the pier and the shortened line became a depot for the PW Department. It is in this period that the line has been modelled - June 1980.

A quick look at the layout

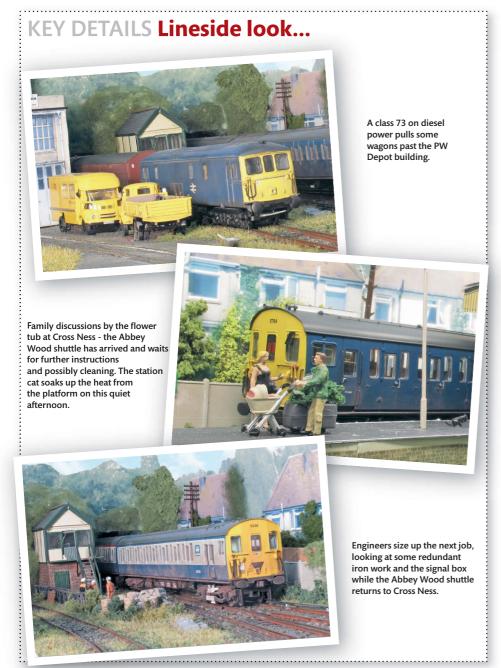
There is a bay platform, the preserve of the Abbey Wood shuttle. Sometimes it may play host to a visiting MLV, a rare visitor to the station, but now that the PW depot is in full swing becoming more common on stores runs. The main platform can cope with over five coaches, so London-bound trains start from here. Passengers are warned that at off peak times the unit may be split and they have to board the front unit of the train or risk being sat at the station for longer than intended!

Adjacent to the station is a two-car carriage servicing platform. The attendants to this duty have a small brick-built shed to hide in at the station end of the yard, hidden from the road by a high brick wall. The rest of the track is all concerned with the PW Depot. A run-round loop and a couple of short sidings help with the sorting of stock, before it is despatched elsewhere on service. Outside the depot building there is a short length of inset track. Historians might note that this marks the site of the old goods shed, demolished when the new depot building was constructed. The siding being useful, it was left in situ. The main yard for the depot is situated behind these buildings. Following the alignment of the quay branch they are not visible from either the station or its approaches.

This covers the history of Cross Ness - some is fiction and some is embroidered reality!

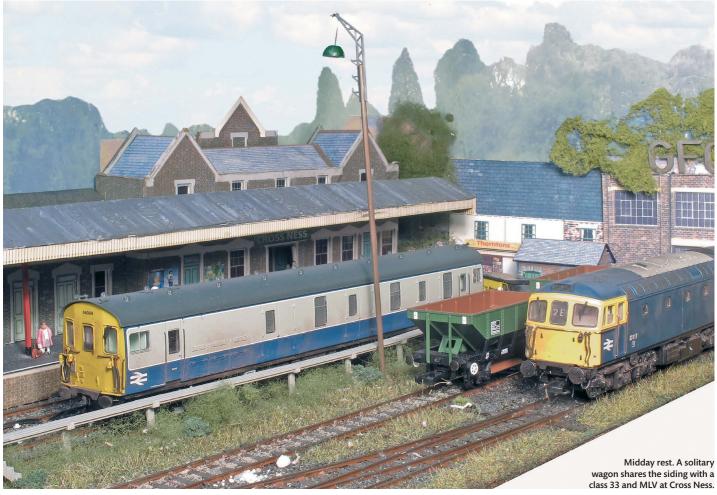
Building the layout

I already had a set of boards stripped of most of their former exhibition layout and sitting in the shed was a supply of SMP track and points. These had been purchased from a colleague in the office a few years previously. Although made up with phosphor bronze rail, once laid and painted, it does tend to have an underused look. Full scale planning (placing points onto a paper plan) soon showed that I was short of only two points for a working layout. A couple of surplus and very long SMP points were heated up with a blow torch, dismantled and reconstructed to better suit their new location. All the points are therefore of copper clad and solder construction and most of the

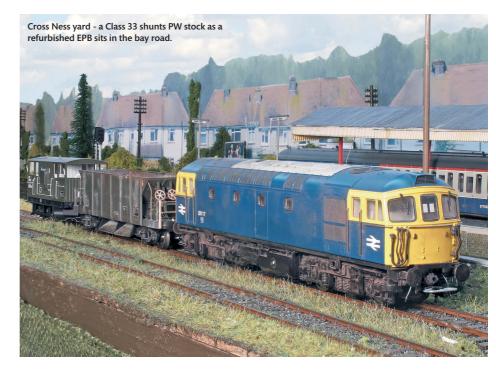
plain track is SMP 'flexitrack'. On the lines used by the electric stock, Peco third rail and third rail insulators have been used.

The exception to the SMP track is that on the site of the goods shed, actually built over the site of a pond on the previous layout. The track is made from four lengths of code 100 rail. Two are laid conventionally, two more lengths are tipped on their side, such that their heads sit in the web of the running rails. This method of tramway track building was developed by P D Hancock, of Craig & Mertonford fame, back in the 1950s and seems still to work for me. It gives a shallow flangeway and simulates the single metal plate sometimes used instead of a rail in these situations. It also gives, once soldered up, a very solid piece of track work, useful when sitting over a resin pond bed! On a small layout (Cross Ness is 2m x 31cm for the viewable part), inset track allows for some scenic work and makes the impact of all that rail much less evident.

Points are operated by H&M motors, crossing polarity and coil selection being carried out using DPDT switches, one side wired for the point motor and the other for the crossing. The point motor common is bonded to the body of the switch, so an electric pencil touching the switch body or toggle effects the point change. A simple system avoiding damage to small switches by the solenoid current and arcing. The toggles on the switches also show the point direction at a glance.

Background and buildings

In order to construct the layout as simply as possible, much use was made of my PC. The station building started life as a Super Quick country station and Island platform building.

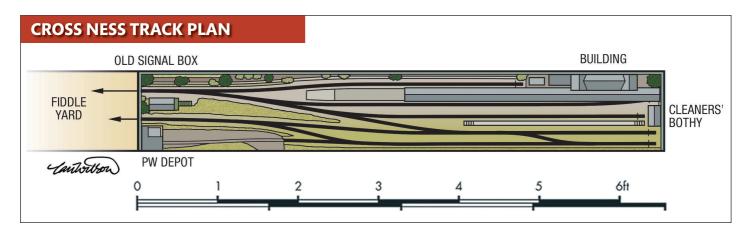


These were scanned, with windows, doors, etc. moved and replaced and a new roof line made up. The whole was then printed a few times, the first on glossy photo grade paper (this made the windows themselves), the rest printed on matt paper. These had various features cut out, once they had been glued to card, each layer having less left than the previous. The result is a card building with more depth than would otherwise be possible. The resulting building also differs from those seen on other layouts. The factory at

the far right-hand end is a rescaled and similarly treated Bilteezi Dairy kit, and the depot itself came from an Auhagen card kit. The bothy for the cleaners is a cut down version of the signing on shed at Sheringham on the North Norfolk Railway. A simple square-on photo being rescaled and then modified as above.

The signal box was partly Dapol, the rest bits of Will's Scenic sheet and some packaging. The backscene was taken from a picture of the trees on the far side of Wroxham Broad, in Norfolk,





the panorama being printed at about 6% density on ordinary office paper to give a fuzzy and soft image, setting the background to a narrow scene but not drawing attention to itself. Onto this was pasted a much modified set of 1930s terraced houses from the lower end of my road. Taken from across a field, this avoids parallax, hence the Broadland trees. I spent some time firstly removing the roof extensions and Velux windows and then all the satellite dishes! The buildings were printed a suitable size, they are meant to be some distance from the tracks at the tops of their gardens.

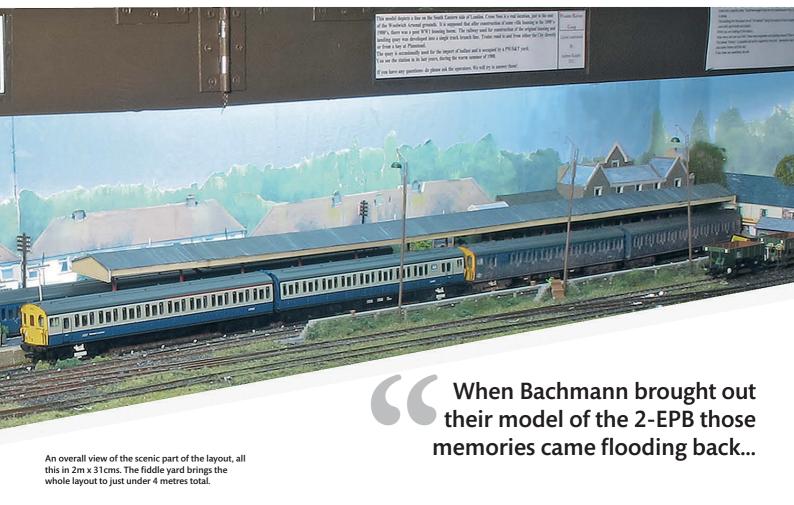
Separating the houses from the railway is the ubiquitous Southern Railway concrete panel fence. This came from Peco, simply assembled, painted and then weathered. Various bits of scenic 'fluff' simulate the gardens and closer trees and Woodland Scenics help to blend it all together. Much of the rest of the board has static grass applied over the top of ground foam scenic dressing. This makes for a much more uneven ground and a more unkempt look.

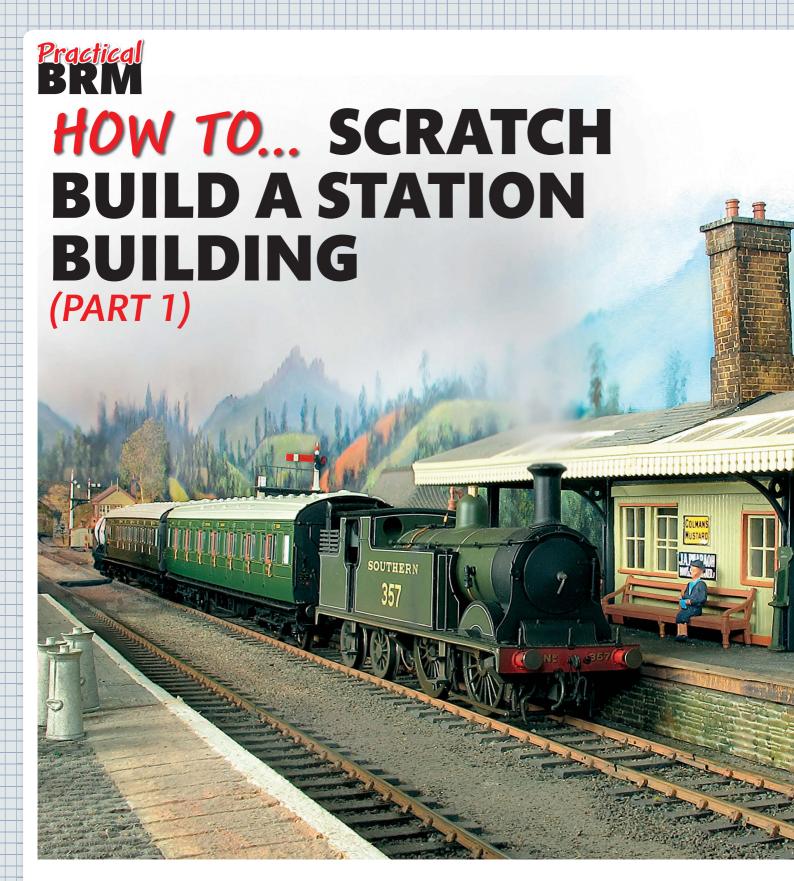
Lastly we come to the subject of couplers. As the layout is operated from the front and end, some form of automated coupling is a must, but with much coupling done on curves, most couplers were ruled out. Playing around with magnets, I discovered that it was comparatively simple to modify the Hornby hook to magnetic operation. A simple addition of some thin brass wire behind the hook allows the stock to be pre-uncoupled on a magnet and then propelled to its final location. The stock thus has one modified Hornby hook at one end, the other end is a simple wire loop. With the brass wire in place the plastic loop is too thick to work reliably. The loops are fitted to cut down Hornby coupler bases, so all may be simply plugged in or changed. Once everything is bedded down, it is likely that I will paint or blacken the couplers, making them much less

obvious. At the first show they were surprisingly successful once fully adjusted and once the operators had found the magnets.

What next? Well, working colour lights for one thing. The Dapol ones fit the bill, but I will try and fit them with some LEDs before too long. The signal box, although abandoned, is meant to have some use. I have a few ideas, but simply ran out of time before the first public showing.

One last thing will be a reliable class 73. The Hornby one runs fine in the fiddle yard but cannot cope with the finer SMP rail and ballast, a problem which neither the Bachmann EMUs nor Heljan 33s have. So, before the next show, a little metal will have to be skimmed from those flanges, then it should be able to participate in the full service on the line. We can then use those picture cards of the rolling stock to tell us how to arrange the stock and let the viewers see how we are doing.





To conclude the building and scenic projects for his Dartmoor-based layout 'Tawcombe', **David Wright** shows how a scratch built model can be built from low cost materials.

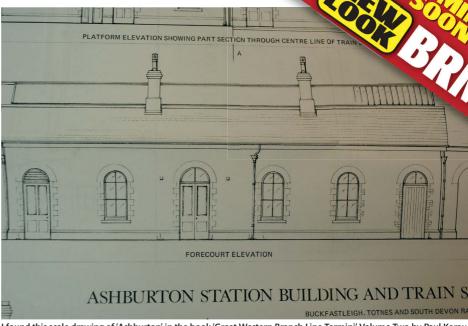
hen I first built Tawcombe back in 2005, I decided to use, and build, the Ratio station building kit which is a Great Western example and fitted my requirements for the layout at the time. Although the building has served me well over the last eight years, I decided to replace it with a more prototypical

building to suit my South Devon location. The Ratio model is based on Castle Cary in Somerset - south west but not quite South Devon!

Looking through reference material, I settled on the station building provided for the branch line termini, both at Moretonhamstead and Ashburton. The perfect reference book for

this project would be *Great Western Branch Line Termini, Volume Two* by Paul Karau and published by Oxford Publishing Co. although this book is now out of print. This book provides photographic reference, but more importantly detailed scale drawings, giving the modeller the perfect starting point to produce a miniature version of these buildings.





I found this scale drawing of 'Ashburton' in the book 'Great Western Branch Line Termini' Volume Two by Paul Karau. This gave me the perfect starting point for my model. The drawing has been reproduced here with the kind permission of Paul Karau of 'Wild Swan Publications'.

Painting the Mortar

To create the mortar colour a mix of Naples Yellow and Titanium White oil paint was added to turpentine thinners to a consistency of 20% paint to 80% thinners. This will give a colour wash, which can be brushed onto the scribed out clay skin. Capillary action will take the thinned down colour into all the mortar gaps and give the stone a base colour. With the paint being so thin, it will be dry in minutes ready for the first dry brushing of the stone colour tones to be added. I put out these colours from the tubes a couple of days before applying them to the model. This was to allow most of the oil to evaporate leaving a dry pigment. The oil paint colours I selected were: Raw Umber, Yellow Ochre, Warm Red, Naples Yellow, Paynes Grey and Titanium White.

The dry paint was mixed together to create the shades on a palate. Using colour photographs, the paint was then dry brushed over the surface, going over several times to build up the colour tones replicating something like the photographic reference.

A close up of a prototype building to give reference to replicate the stone colour. (Top Tip: If your prototype building has been demolished, and you only have black and white image for reference. Try photographing a building built from the same materials and in the same locality. This should give an accurate colour reference for when you come to paint your model).



What material to use?

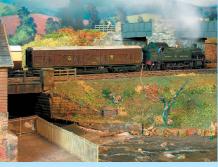
I decided on using a double skin with a new material that I was introduced to at an exhibition. The material is called 'Foamex' which is a high density form of foam board used for exhibition and advertising promotional panels.

The material is only 3mm thick which makes cutting fairly easy. The material is stronger although, slightly heavier than foam board.

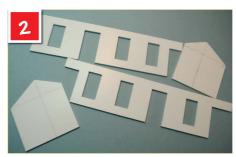

The Ratio station building, based on Castle Cary, will be replaced with a more accurate scratch-built model for my South Devon layout, Tawcombe.



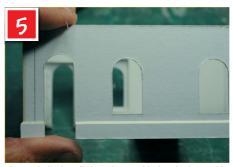
I used 3mm Foamex for the inner walls and the roof sub-base - cut the window and door apertures over size.



The outer walls and other parts are 1.5mm mounting board. The windows were cut to actual size with arched tops using a compass cutter with a new, sharp blade.



The main walls constructed together with inner carcase clearly visible. Bracing has been added inside. I use double-sided Sellotape for a clean, strong bond.



The card plinth walls have been added to the base with an angled top.



Strips of card have been glued to the eaves to form the cornice on the front and rear elevation walls.



The arched lintels for the doors and windows were cut from old Christmas cards.



The completed walls are now ready for the Das clay skin to be added.



Pressing the modelling clay to achieve the desired scale thickness for the model.



Leave the clay skin at least 24 hours to completely dry before scribing - I use a blunt 10A blade and old toothbrush to brush away the powdered debris.



With the Das skin scribed to replicate the stonework, the first stage of painting has started - this is a wash of colour to represent the mortar.



Scribe out the corner and window quoins first. Save any powder debris to later rub into the stone colouring to soften the effect and also brush into the mortar gaps.

s a young lad I was fascinated by models, models of everything: cars, planes, buildings and, in particular, model trains and the layouts they ran on. My uncle was the source of my fascination with model railways. You see, it wasn't the history of railways that excited me, nor the relevance of the splendid liveries, but that they were exquisite miniature replicas of real life.

I started out, inspired by my uncle's GWR layout, as many a youngster does, with an under-the-bed effort. Basic yes, but it provided me with many hours of fun. It was of course a simpler time; no DCC, sound or smoke, computer control, etc. Just a simple double track loop and some sidings. My fleet at that time - I remember it clear as day - was an A4 *Mallard* in BR green with a blood and custard train and 'Smokey Joe' which I see Hornby still produce! That was it. Pocket money was not generous enough for much more, but it was enough for me.

The only problem was that in emulating my uncle I found myself in very unfamiliar territory. I'd never seen a steam loco in the flesh (so to speak). I had no fond memories of steam fuelled summer holidays. My experiences were a world away from the country halt and a

Pannier tank. I grew up in Sidcup, Kent. My experience of trains was far less attractive though no less emotive. I spent many a dreary day trundling back and forth to Charing Cross and Cannon Street on the daily commuter crush. Many a night too! I have memories of watching freight trains thunder under the footbridge at Sidcup station and down the line a little to the footbridge at St George's Park. My interest in trains and model railways wained as life got in the way and other things demanded my attention.

Fast forward ten years and my interest was again peaked by a layout depicting Network SouthEast in the late '80s early '90s called Shaftesbury. I was hooked. It spoke to me. This is what trains meant to me. This was what I remembered - slam doors, blue/grey and red, white and blue! The die was cast - this was what I remembered and I wanted my own layout.

The problem was that I lived in Central London in a 'bijou' one bed flat with my partner and the eponymous cat, George. There isn't much room to, well, swing a cat. Still, deterred I was not. After a severe lack of planning and even less consultation I ordered myself some baseboards. Initially the boards were comprised thus, 7' x 2' and 4' x 2'. The main scenic part was

to be 7' 0" and the storage tracks would take up the 4' 0" board. Oh, how naïve I was!

Trains are long. Longer than my complete lack of planning had accounted for. I couldn't fit four carriages and a loco in my platforms (Ratio, by the way). There was, of course, only one option. I ordered a further board, 1' x 2'. Phew, sorted. I then realised that while the trains would now fit in my platforms, they were too long for the storage tracks. Well, guess what, another board was ordered. The layout is currently 18' long incorporating a 6' traverser with eight tracks. It is unlikely to extend further in its current location on account of some obstructive walls - it has taken over the

Having been away from the hobby for far too many years I was baffled by the new technologies that now existed. DCC, decoders, computer control. I decided that all the whistles and bells was what I wanted and so DCC it was. Two wires? Easy peasy!

Problem two. I had not used a soldering iron before. Save for an unfortunate incident at school. I knew nothing about electrics. I mean nothing! So, I embarked on this project with something of a handicap. Several may be more accurate.

I was very lucky to be invited to join a model rail forum called Model Rail Group by a questionable fella called 'young' Dave. 'Young' Dave is actually responsible for the station



building and signal box that now adorn the completed (sic) layout. The box, although crafted by Dave, is an inheritance from a now departed Shaftesbury (in its OO incarnation that is). Now after joining this merry band of modellers it was suggested that I document my efforts in a 'thread'. The cold sweats started around this time. I knew very little about trains save for the fact I liked them, even less about electrics and, if it is at all possible, even less about scenery and the associated 'stuff' that goes into making a convincing model railway.

The basics

Some facts about George Lane. Track is Peco Code 75 concrete sleeper type. I only remember seeing concrete sleepers so this is what I thought was best for me. It is run under DCC *via* an Ecos and iTrain computer software and all points are operated *via* 'Tortoise' switch machines.

I now know a lot about soldering and a heap about electrics! This is mainly due to the ever enduring patience of my friends on the forum. Resistors are jolly handy too by the way.

The layout is not a pure breed, it is a mongrel. It is a mish mash of ideas and input from a lot of people, but I am very pleased with what has resulted. George Lane is a fictitious town, somewhere in south east London *circa* 1985-1989 (although, many a steam special can be found running on occasion. By occasion, I

mean most operating sessions). It's a mixture of scratch-bulit (signal box and station) - not by me - and bridge (by me) and proprietary items. The Limpet Cement warehouse was actually cast by me following a mould-making and casting tutorial/frenzy on MRG. Messy but immensely rewarding.

Scenery was a dark art to me. Although the leaps and bounds in what is available to us modellers nowadays certainly makes the task a lot easier. Ground cover is a mix of Green Scenes textured paint (concrete and light earth) and static grass from Woodland Scenics and Green Scene. The track and its ballast was given a filthy coat of Model Mates 'oil brown' which seems to have created a pleasingly grotty looking Permanent Way.

One of the things that was clearly lacking (I say clearly, it took several of my forum friends to point it out), was the scourge of modern times that is litter. Trackside in particular. Litter, well, litters the trackside in the guise of plastic bags, crisp packets, newspapers, etc. So, it had to be modelled. Google images provided all the

material I needed to make my own OO mess. The security fencing that protects the industrial estate from the perils of a speeding 125 is now strewn with tiny newspapers, minuscule crisp packets and microscopic Cola cans.

The newspapers and crisp packets are actually real images of actual brands shrunk on the computer, double sided and crumpled up.

The newspapers, if I recall, are actually Spanish, though. A soak in water mixed with brown ink and then left to dry produced a pleasing aged look. Cola and lager cans were painstakingly crafted from 'micro strip', spray painted an appropriate colour (red for cola and green for lager I figured was okay) and then tiny dabs of white or yellow paint to represent the logo.

Thanks to a great deal of help George Lane is now able to run on its own while I sit and sip a glass of wine via the marvel of computer software (iTrain) and electronics (LDT and S88 connections).

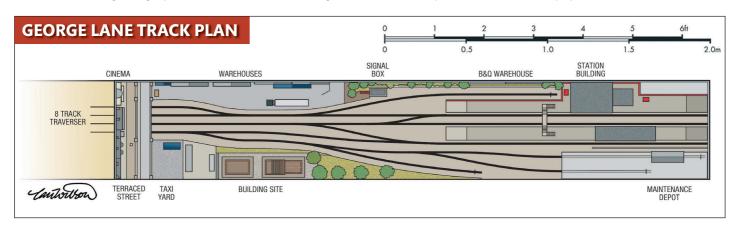
This layout started, to some extent on a whim, but has grown to become a very

important and enjoyable part of my life. I have had ups and downs along the way. This modelling lark is rarely plain sailing but I have met some dear friends and am so glad that I took the leap.

Looking back through the thread I was 'told' to start I can see that the layout was bare boards back on April 2, 2011, which means this has been done in just over a year. I dread to think what I have spent on bits and bobs and trains, and some more trains, ooh, and that nice shiny one - I don't care. Something that can bring this much learning, fun and pleasure is priceless.

Practical BRN

HOW TO... BUILD A SCRAPYARD LOCO

Michael Russell says rust in peace...

he basis for this article is the Dapol kit of the GWR Prairie tank locomotive. Building the kit without modification using the instructions supplied will provide you with a crude representation of the prototype. However, over time most scrapyard locos were raided for parts or were practised on by the cutting crews and so often had all sorts of interesting disfigurements. Modifying the kit in this way, and making it more realistic, will provide you with something that will be individualised and a source of greater satisfaction. Gain inspiration by taking a look at some of the scrapyard pictures held online or consult one of the many books available on the subject. Collect together pictures of the subject to consult for accuracy. Drawings are invaluable and I used the one by F.J. Roche in the Historic Locomotive Drawings publication. Even better, visit a member of the class you are modelling at a preserved railway to see the prototype for yourself.

Conclusion

As usual, you don't have to implement all of the modifications shown here and I wouldn't

recommend some of the techniques to a beginner, so pick and choose the ones that you're happy with. To gain experience before tackling a project like this, try building a few plastic kits straight from the box. More modern kits don't require much preparation before assembly and the parts are a good fit. Try the techniques out on spare parts or pieces of plasticard to practise beforehand. Don't worry if your early efforts don't come out as well as you expect - a good paint and weathering job will mask many shortcoming and besides, people won't expect a pristine finish on a scrapyard loco, so there is more room for error than with something in showroom condition.

If you wish to 'go the whole hog' and really pull out all the stops, then don't expect to finish quickly. However, projects like this lend themselves to short bursts of activity, because it is often necessary to wait for glue or paint to dry. So, if you're the sort of person who has just an hour or two to spare several nights per week, then projects such as this are ideal.





The original loco sides. The detail is crude and I removed 95% of it. This all has to be added back again later, and you must decide if you are willing to go to that length, however, it is often difficult to remove just some of the detail, because it is very easy to damage other detail whilst doing so. Use a course file to start with, moving to a finer file and finally wet and dry paper to achieve a smooth finish. Use filler if you have been over enthusiastic at this stage.



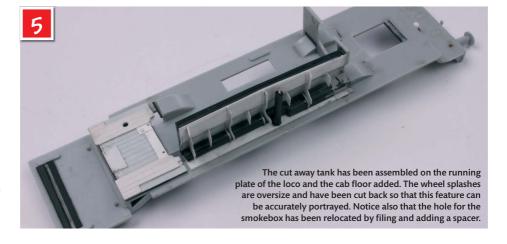
The cab sides have been widened to represent the water space and all the controls on the firebox have been removed. It is a good idea to build the model from a number of sub assemblies like this.



The bogies are the original Dapol items suitably modified. To avoid weakening them too much, I retained the original mounting lugs. Since the wheel axles will be on view, I remounted the original Dapol items on new thinner axles.



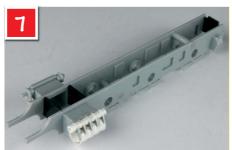
Parts for the bunker. I boxed in the toolboxes so that I could portray them with the lids removed. Note that the material has been thinned around the coal hole this technique can make a big difference to the appearance of the model.







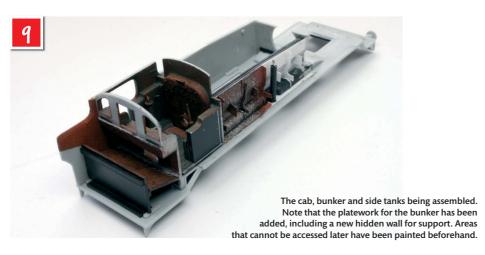
A new smokebox was fabricated, but the saddle was cut from the original part and reused. See the techniques' section for more information on this.



The frames have been assembled and new spacers added to supplement existing ones for added strength. Note that one of the cylinders has been filed down and tubing added to represent a disassembled unit.



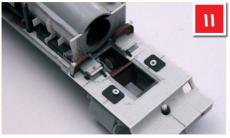
The original sandboxes have been cut off and moved further out using spacers. The original mountings for the bogies have been cut from the running plate and reattached between the frames. The brakes hangers have been scratchbuilt and fitted. The wheels have been trial fitted and the flanges pared down to more realistic proportions. Mount the wheels in a drill and turn the flanges down using a file.





The cab roof has been added and detailed with 20 thou strip. Beading has been added to the edges of the cab and bunker surfaces as per the prototype. The wire for the window bars has been added using copper wire from an old motor armature – I should have done this before the can was assembled.

Overlays have been made from 20 thou plasticard and added to the running plate. Note that more of the latter has been cut away to reveal the space beneath the boiler.



Towards the later stages of the build, delicate parts can be fitted. The handrail knobs are from the Alan Gibson range, but the other items and all scratch-built. Boiler cladding has been made from 5 thou plastic card. These are difficult parts to fabricate and you may want to trial fit these using a paper template to avoid wasting material. The lagging is made from toilet tissue held in place with cyanoacrylate glue.



Techniques...

To make round parts such as smokebox doors, tubeplates or wheel balance weights, use a compass cutter. Use a thin material such as 20 thou plasticard. Cut several parts and laminate them to get the thickness you want, ensuring that you leave them to dry for at least 24 hours before working with them.



To make boiler barrels, use two different thicknesses of metal tube to sandwich the material between. For the prairie tank, I used a piece of shower rail placed inside some copper gas pipe. Use 20 thou plasticard and to ensure a tight fit in the tubes, use several layers of the material pre cut to the correct length. Dip the assembly into boiling water for about 15 seconds and then retrieve using a suitable tool and cool immediately under cold water.



Parts sometimes need to be clamped together whilst they dry. Use objects such as hair grips, clothes pegs, rubber bands and other clamps. Sometimes you need to improvise. In this picture, I fitted the new roof using the kit roof part as a former because it was the correct profile for the clamping operation.



Boiler cladding has been made from 5 thou plasticard. These are difficult parts to fabricate and you may want to trial fit these using a paper template to avoid wasting material. The lagging is made from toilet tissue held in place with cyanoacrylate glue.



The wheels and frames have been painted separately before being united. The brake rigging has been fitted. The cylinder drain cocks are made from handrail knobs.

Bespoke Buildings

confess that I often need a deadline in order to get moving with my modelling, and in the absence of same for my 'Big Pub Build' model my modelling had ground to a halt. Calculating that by working to a deadline this would also have an overall positive effect on my modelling, I volunteered to build something for the RMWeb/BRM layout, Black Country Blues.

After a few emails back and forth with Chris (2ManySpams), two buildings were considered as suitable: an industrial building in Oldbury Road, West Bromwich (Gate number 5 at IB & S Lees Trident Steel Works) and the Tennants'

office building on Ryders Green Road, West Bromwich.

Oldbury Road

The first construction started was the Oldbury Road structure. I began by collecting as many photographs as possible; then by drawing upon my collection of Google Earth images, images that the BCB crew were able to take, plus a few bits and bobs from t'interweb, I was able to set about sketching out preliminary construction plans.

The next step was to add the cladding (South Eastern Finecast embossed sheet) and then make

good on the windows and doors. As accuracy and fidelity to the prototype was the watchword for this project, I turned to the massed expertise of the RMWeb membership for the identification of the brick bonds used in the building and the extension. The main Oldbury Road building was identified as being Flemish Garden Wall (three rows of stretchers then one of alternate headers and stretchers), whereas the lean-to and boundary wall beyond was identified as English Garden Wall (three rows of stretchers, then one of headers). As such bonds are not commercially available, it was agreed to use the closest match; accordingly a mixture of SEF English and Flemish Bond was used (whilst it would be nice to use the completely accurate bond, somehow I doubt that there will be many brick-work-pedants - to put it kindly - amongst the exhibition visitors and as an exhibition layout I think the occasional brickwork compromise is acceptable).

I first clad the Oldbury Road Structure with the SEF brick facings and then cut out the apertures for the windows and doors.

After playing around with an off-cut of SEF embossed plastic card to find the best paint combination that would best match the Oldbury Road building's brickwork, it was



As Chris had been able to get some good, detailed pictures of the building, I was able to create a composite photograph from his excellent snaps - this composite photo was then imported into PowerPoint, resized to 4mm/ foot and converted into facade sketches (in the image on page 46 the dotted red line shows the level cellar base, the side of the building slopes going left to right in the original). I then used these to create the framework plans.

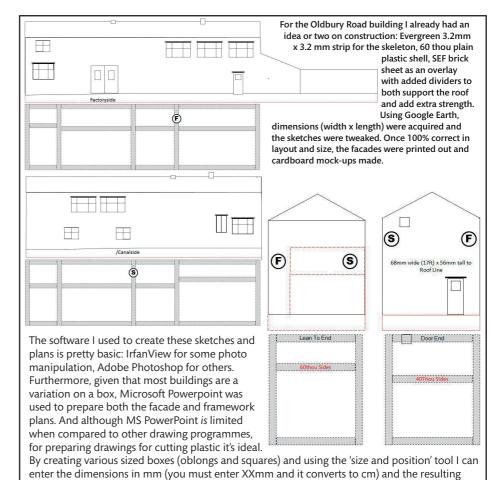

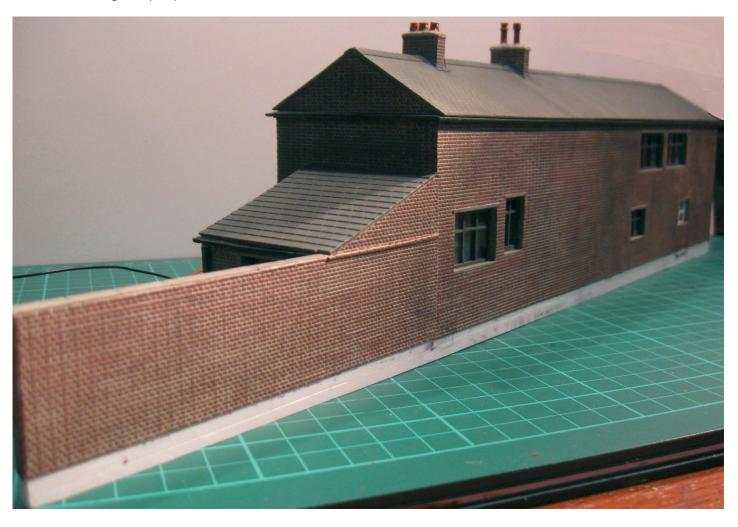
decided to use an undercoat of Revell Acrylic 'Rust' (83), followed by a wash of dilute Tamiya 'Deck Tan' (XF-55), then dry brushed with Revell Acrylic 'Brick Red' (37) with various highlighting of individual/short rows of brick in lighter and darker shades. Having dry brushed the brown brick colour over the 'mortar' undercoat I wasn't very satisfied with the result, so I ended up painting in or touching up all the bricks on the entire building, tedious but it did improve the model's appearance.

I then began constructing the windows by gluing clear plastic into place behind the window apertures and then building the frames using painted plastic strip. However, I was less than satisfied with the result. A quick flurry of emails between myself and the BCB team resulted in an order being placed with York Model Making for some laser-cut windows (using my sketches for dimensions and layout) – courtesy of *BRM's* generous support.

With the deadline approaching for delivery of both the Oldbury Road building and the Tennants' office building to the BCB team at the Ally Pally show in March, I was getting increasingly nervous over the non-arrival of the laser-cut windows. Finally, a week and a half before the delivery date, the windows arrived and a few late night modelling sessions saw the windows glazed and installed; the office installed and illuminated and the roof test-fitted, adjusted, painted and glued into place. A wash of diluted Tamiya 'NATO Black' (XF-69) added some grime and the model was packed into its' bespoke shipping container.

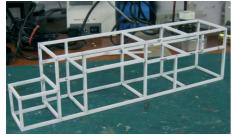
I then jumped on a jet to London and couriered the buildings to Ally Pally.





printout is pretty much spot on for dimensions.

Construction began with the framework. I used the Northwest Shortline 'The Chopper' (guillotine for plastic materials) to ensure that all rod was cut identically. Once I had a pile of cut rods, I then assembled each side separately, ensuring squareness with a set square. When dry, the two sides were joined. What can be seen is that the framework differs from side to side as the beams have been inserted to insure that the windows are cleared.



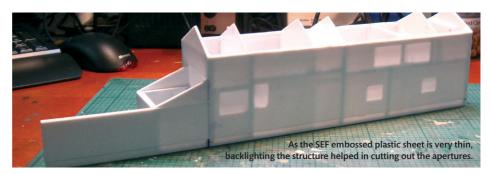
The 60thou facade was cut out using the facade sketches printed out onto paper and then pasted onto the plastic sheet with a 'PrittStick'. Once the facade was cut out, the sides and ends were dipped in warm water and the remains of the paper template removed. The facade pieces were checked against the skeleton framework, minor adjustments made and then glued into place using MekPak solvent.

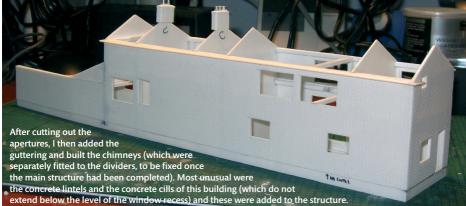


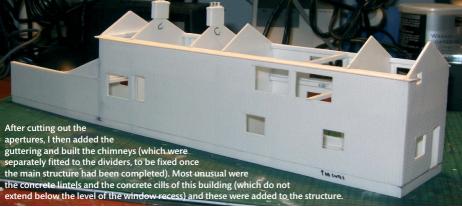
The mock-up was pretty straightforward, with only the slightly saggy roof causing some concern - the internal dividers/roof supports in the production model took care of that. Following the build, I made notes on some tweaks to do on the production drawings and added an extra window at the door end and a door on the leanto. The mock-up was sent to Chris who slotted it into the BCB under construction to test fit.

One of the things I always try to add to the buildings I construct is an illuminated interior. Accordingly, it was agreed to add an office to the building. As with the facade, I used PowerPoint to create the detailed walls and floors, building an open box out of 40 Thou plastic, which was then furnished with bits and pieces from my scrap box and a purpose built filing cabinet (a plastic box overlayed with an image of a real filing cabinet). As the Eagle-eyed may spot, adorning the wall is a bonafide 1974 Pirelli Calendar (and the subject of which pinup to put on the wall of this 1970s office was the subject of much erudite debate on RMWeb!). Alas, close ups are somewhat cruel but at normal viewing distance (and later, when viewed through the Oldbury Road building's windows), it is acceptable.

Project Layout

The Tennants office building

The second construction for the BCB was the Tennants Office Building in Ryders Green Road, West Bromwich. As the build was very similar to that of the Oldbury Road Building, I'll only highlight the difference. As before, a cardboard mock-up was made from my facade drawings and sent to Chris for siting on the BCB layout.

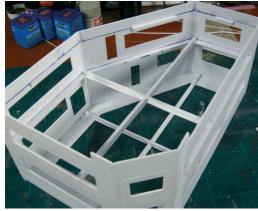
Like the Oldbury Road building, I had tried to construct windows by glazing first and adding frames and window bars using plastic strip; and like the Oldbury Road building, this didn't work out well. So duly a request for laser-cut windows wends its way to the BCB financiers and whilst awaiting the arrival of the windows, I built the etched-brass fire escape for behind the building.

With the arrival of the laser-cut windows for Oldbury Road, came the laser-cut windows for the Tennants building. A large pot of coffee was made and a couple of marathon modelling sessions saw me complete the building in time for delivery to the Ally Pally show.

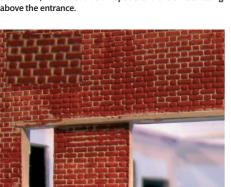


In regards to construction, my first (and main) departure from the Oldbury Road construction was a modified framework: for the Tennants building I cut out two plastic sheet floors, removing most of the floor to leave a frame (and to allow access) which was strengthened with the addition of Evergreen 3.2mm x 3.2mm rod (a time saver, I thought, but it was neither a time saver or any better than a plastic rod skeleton).





The building was clad with SEF Flemish Bond embossed sheet and the window and door apertures cut out. At the same time, I added the down-spouts and the ornate facing above the entrance.

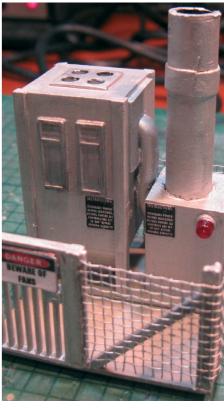


Another attempt at saving time was to try home 'Tampo printing'. After having spent about 16 hours painting individual bricks for Oldbury Road, I looked around for a faster method. The idea of Tampo (or pad) printing came to mind. With Hornby and Bachmann using the process to create superb finishes (the LNER teak finish on the Gresley suburban is apparently a 175 separate individual tampo print process), I thought to myself 'how hard would it be to use the same approach to paint brick faces on embossed sheet?' I did a little research and found that pad printing uses a silicon rubber pad - which meant that I could recycle some old silicon rubber moulds. Then, after a poster on RMWeb had some success using sponge makeup pads, I bought a sponge rubber makeup pad and used that as well. For the 'ink' that's used in the Tampo/Pad printing process I used Revell 'Brick Red' water thinnable acrylic paints (but unthinned). The results were most certainly the proverbial Curate's Egg at best: both silicon rubber and sponge rubber pad took some getting used to in order to lay down paint neatly on the brick surfaces, but it was achievable, with both the silicon rubber pad and the makeup sponge. However, I found that without a specialised, custom made pad, the process only worked when the surface was completely flat - something lacking in my buildings. I ended up repainting the building, brick-by-brick, which was tedious but resulted in a very nice coverage.



I then constructed a laboratory for the illuminated interior (I had thought about building a typing pool, but drew the line at scratch-building 30 typewriters, desks, chairs and secretaries). Based upon my own lab at University, the laboratory room turned out quite nicely, although some of the equipment is a bit 'Heath Robinson' (which is, I suppose, also prototypical).

What to do with the truncated corner of the building remained a puzzle, I had considered a loading bay, but this was negated by lack of space behind the bay (the reason for truncating the building in the first place). A lengthy discussion took place on the Tennants Building thread on RMWeb and - having taken into account 1970s fire regulations (so no storage of gas cylinders against the wall) and 1970s working environments (so no soft, effete air conditioning), it was decided to place an air scrubber behind what had now become a laboratory building. The internet was duly searched for prototypical inspiration and an 'Air Scrubber' enclosure built for behind the building. A bit crude, perhaps, but it filled the hole and is (fairly) prototypical.

HOW TO... SOLDER THE LOCO CHASSIS

Part 11: For the last two instalments of this series, Adrian Marks shows you how to solder that first loco kit together...

ccurate coupling rods, frames and bearings in which the wheels can run true are the foundation for a frustration-free model loco. In the past I've built locos without chassis jigs, with simple alignment axles, with a Hobby Holidays

Alignment axles – these from Metalsmith come with compression springs to aid the fitting of hornguides.

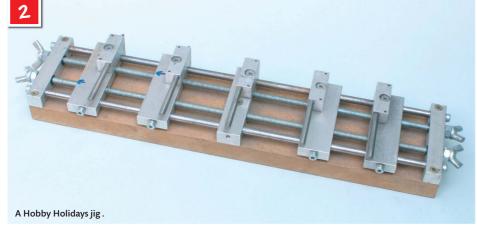
jig and the Avonside Works Chassis2 Pro, and with care, in all cases it's possible to build a free-running chassis. Conversely, without taking care, in each case it's possible to build a chassis which will cause you no end of frustration. If you've been following this series and have plucked up the courage to build your own brass wagons and coaches, then I'm confident you are now competent enough to build a sweet-running loco.

Whichever scale you model in, be sensible about the loco of your choice. Yes, I've heard stories (and know some modellers) who have successfully built a 'Britannia' or an A3, a 'Duchess' or a 9F as their first loco. It does happen, but realistically they're few and far between, so I suggest you're better off cutting your teeth on something a little more manageable and which can be completed in a reasonable timescale.

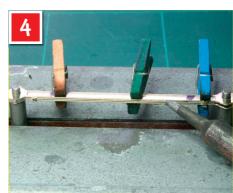
First of all conduct a little research by reading magazines and forums and talk to layout owners and members of scale societies at exhibitions to see what other modellers say about certain kits which might interest you. For anyone interested in 7mm scale steam I always recommend Jim McGeown's Connoisseur Models. Jim even has a 'starter loco kit' in his range which is loosely based on an LSWR prototype, and comes with highly detailed instructions filled with photographs of a model under construction; it's the perfect introduction to building loco kits. From his website you can even download the instructions in pdf format before you buy.

This article is not the place to discuss the pros and cons of solid, compensated or fully-sprung chassis (whether using coil springs or CSBs), nor the merits of fold-up, milled, or RTR gearboxes, or even worm and wheel or helical spur gears. To cover them all adequately the editor would have to dedicate an entire issue or three to the subject, and then the next couple of issues would be filled cover-to-cover with high-octane letters from readers arguing the toss! Instead, my intention here is to keep things as simple as possible and deal with the constructional aspects, so this month I'm building a Connoisseur LNER J15 chassis.

And that's it. Your only decisions you'll need to make are which pick-ups and gearbox/motor unit.







I always begin by assembling the coupling rods. Although I always remove the cusp on all etched parts before soldering, laminated coupling rods and inside/ outside motion parts are an exception, and you'll see why. These particular rods are jointed and I've set up one half on the jig. The holes have been opened out to 2.4mm (use a drill or reamer) for a tight fit on the mock axles, and the laminations are clamped with pegs. The edges are well fluxed and solder introduced, covering the cusped edges. Work quickly so the metal doesn't try to expand and bend. I now add any overlays on the big ends and the knuckle.



Remove the rods from the jig, put them in a vice and with an old file (definitely not your best one!), and successively fine grades of wet and dry paper, file back and dress the edges until the laminated parts appear to be a solid piece of metal. This takes time, so don't rush it. If you find the laminated edges reappearing, introduce a little more solder and file back again. Use exactly the same technique on any inside or outside motion parts.



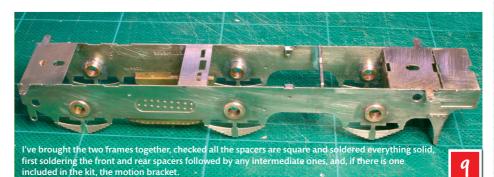
While the frames are in the flat, I add any parts which won't interfere with mounting them on the jig, and here I've added the guard iron overlays and ashpan. I've also opened out the bearing holes with a tapered reamer so that the top hat bearings are a push fit. Note the reversed writing etched into the frame which indicates this half is a mirror-image of the opposing frame.

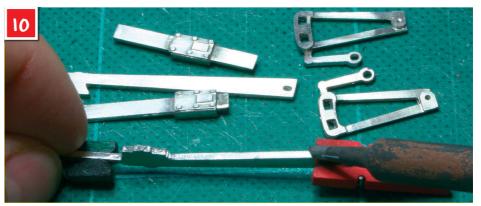


Frame spacers may now be fixed in place. On some kits these are fixed with a screw, but I prefer soldered spacers every time. If you're not using a jig, use an engineer's square to ensure alignment and solder. Again, I'm using 188° solder. Initially I fit the front spacer to one frame and the rear to the other. It's said that this reduces the chances of the frame bowing due to excessive heat, but if you've been following these articles over the months you'll know we've been working on the quick-in, quick-out technique where there is little excess heat spread throughout the metal, so for me it instead serves a double check that everything is being assembled square.



I've reamed the bearings to 3/16" (this is a 7mm model) so they are a tight fit on the mock axles, and I've opened out the centre bearing holes in the frames as they've been etched a few thou. high to eliminate any see-saw effect sometimes seen on rigid six-coupled locos travelling on poorly laid track. The down side of a high centre axle is that you permanently reduce your number of pickups by a third. Besides which, you're going to lay nice flat track - aren't you? A jig will ensure the bearing on the centre axle aligns perfectly with the outer ones. With the frames lying flat on the bearing flanges, use plenty of flux before introducing the solder. For joints such as these I always use 188° solder for strength and plenty of welly on the iron, or alternatively, as here, use a microflame.





This kit comes with cosmetic inside motion made up from laminated nickel silver etches, and I've assembled the parts following exactly the same routine as the coupling rods.





The brake shoes are laminated to their hangers remember half need to face left and half right or you'll end up unsoldering some. Been there, done that! Brake pull rods are laminated together.

I've reamed opposite bearings through with a 4.8mm straight reamer. This gives a nice two thousands of an inch working clearance for the 3/16" axles to run freely without binding or the need to 'run in'.



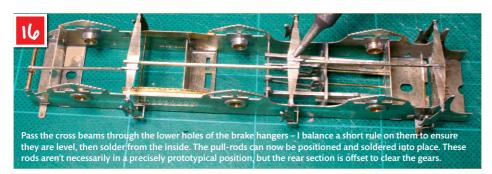
Pass 0.9mm brass wire through the holes across the chassis for the brake hangers, leaving plenty of excess on the outside. Fix with solder on the inside. Solder the brackets in place, leaving the brake hangers loose inside. Trim the excess wire and file back.

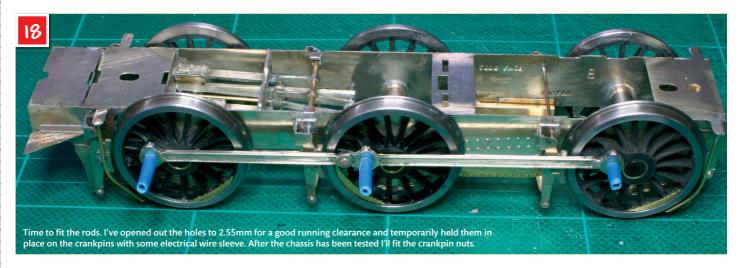


Fit the wheels temporarily, packing them with washers where necessary to ensure they sit centrally. Here I'm using a mini peg to hold the brake shoes in place while the hanger is soldered in position. Use a piece of card to accurately space the brake shoe from the wheel tread.



Final details are the sand pipes and buffer beam reinforcing brackets. I've fitted these brackets upside down as in the intended position they cross the centreline of the buffer holes which would be an issue as I intend to fit sprung buffers. Therefore I fix brackets upside down resulting in a slightly lower position which to my eye is better than no bracket at all.

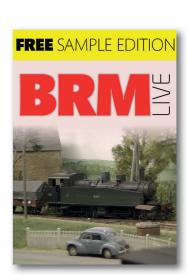

HOW TO... IMPROVE YOUR LAYOUT

Howard Smith and **Richard Wilson** undertake a renovation of the Wisbech and Upwell layout and prepare it for the exhibition circuit once more.

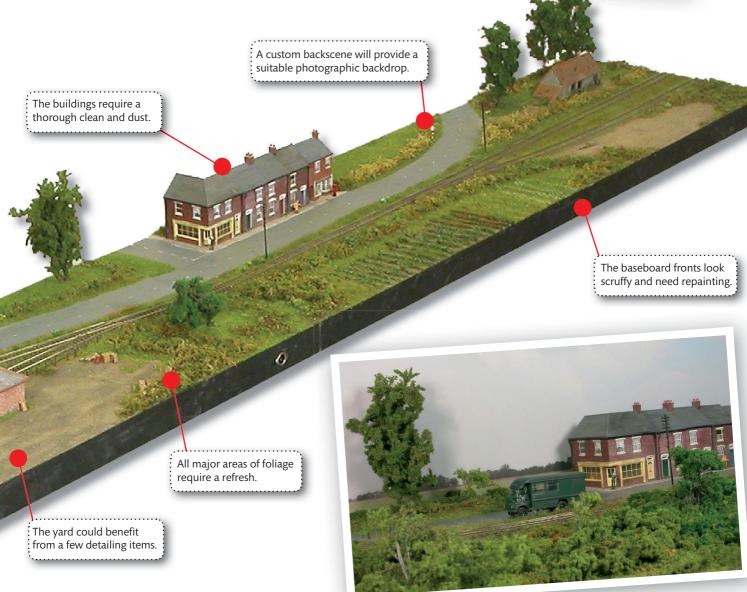
hen Richard and I dug out the Wisbech and Upwell layout from one of our store rooms here, we noticed that it wasn't looking quite as fresh as it once was. The moss had now faded to a pale and somewhat drab green colour; a far cry from the late spring/early summer feel in which this layout was originally set. The dust coated buildings and odd cobweb here and there didn't do much for its overall appearance either. We both decided that it was time to give this layout a well needed refresh, but thought we could go just a few steps further and make it better than new, all in a matter of a few hours.



Other important maintenance tips

- A thorough clean of all wheels on both locomotives and rolling stock will avoid re-depositing dirt on cleaned trackwork.
- Ideally, all electronics should be checked for loose connections or unsoldered wires.
- Check that all point motors are running freely and that point blades come into contact with their adjacent rails.
- Back to backs of rolling stock should be standard, but on the odd occasion may become out of gauge. A quick verification of all stock before running can avoid derailments later on.
- The gears on motive power should be kept lubricated as per the manufacturers specifications, whilst electrical contact cleaner can help to keep pickups clean.







DUSTING

Before the upgrade work commenced, we wanted to see which parts of the scenery were still acceptable and those which would need reworking, so out came the vacuum cleaner. This may sound a little harsh for model scenery, but since most of it was to be replaced, the loose and therefore unwanted areas would become separated, giving a strong and reliable base onto which further scenery could be applied. For the more delicate parts such as buildings, a large soft brush is ideal and avoids damaging intricate parts; however the Hornby Skaledale buildings used on the layout are very quick to clean as no particular parts are able to become detached easily, the buildings being made from one solid mould. This allowed for a rather aggressive and quick clean as we were pushed for time, something not necessarily suited to other more delicate parts of the layout.



DETAILING WOODLAND SCENICS STEP BY STEP





The layout already had areas of static grass present in varing quantities and so Woodland Scenics were our preferred choice in décor materials for variety. The various packs available when combined can help to create different tints and tones and are ideal for revitalising the verdant early summer foliage of the Wisbech and Upwell.

They are not the cheapest, but arguably among the best scenic scatters on the market currently.



Areas which were covered with the now tired moss required building up of volume and cover, and so would serve as an ideal support for the scatters and flocks purchased to represent low scrub and bushes.



The moss was coated in non-diluted PVA glue to seal it, followed by a 50/50 diluted mix and evenly spread with the help of a brush.



We had to act quickly as PVA soon forms an outer skin, making the flock less likely to bond properly.



Foliage clusters and clump foliage were applied to the glue in, as the name suggests, clumps. The trick is not to play with the material too much as we want it to keep its volume and not look flat.



Coarse Turf is then scattered over the ensemble creating a variety in the tones of green used. It is important to know when to leave it alone; some effects can be over done.



The completed hedgerows with wild flowers in bloom. The hedge was from Javis, sprayed brown, then coated in coarse turf for an uneven and more natural look



Trees were added in a variety of shades to add depth to the wooded areas as well as along the roads. The holes were pre-drilled with a hand drill.

HARBURN HAMLET BUILDING

Adding an extra building to a sparse and architecturally devoid layout like the Wisbech and Upwell helps give the eye something to focus on. One of Harburn Hamlet's latest buildings is in a style which could easily have been part of the Wisbech and Upwell tramway. Described as a small brick-built yard office with chimney (FL195), it will easily add a little point of interest to our yard scene.

With a doorway and window, one could imagine this as being used as a yard shunter's cabin or foreman's office.



The chimney is separate in the packaging and merely requires gluing in place with a little super glue.

The building was secured to the baseboards using PVA glue sparingly. Note the scenic scatter which helps to conceal the



The light satin silver tint of the roof cries out to be toned down; a task so simple, yet often overlooked by modellers who exhibit. Rarely is any prototype roof just one overall colour, so adding tints and shades can effectively improve its appearance.



Making use of Humbrol's latest range of Enamel washes and DCC Concepts' weathering powders the roof, brickwork and apertures are all subtly toned down. The roof sheen is later removed by applying matt varnish mixed with a dark grey wash.

ADDING EXTRA DETAIL

Quite often it's the small things that make a big difference to layouts; the odd stray sacks, barrels or crates help to create an impression of a working railway.

Look around most working yards and rarely will you find everything looking tidy.



We had a few accessories from various manufacturers in our 'goodie drawer' which made ideal scenic items for the front of the layout. The sacks originated from Faller, and once cut from the sprue, glued together and painted look fine. Could these be bags of potatoes? The covered, partially covered and un-covered crates are from Harburn Hamlet's new accessory range. Both needed to blend and so were toned down with a combination of Humbrol washes and DCC Concepts weathering powders. All that is now required is to seal them with a coat of matt varnish.

A SIMPLE IMPROVEMENT



When exhibiting, the presentation of any layout is almost as important as what is modelled on it.

Our baseboards have now seen their fair share of exhibitions and the front of the boards are looking a little scuffed and tired through transport. Luckily, no wood filler or sanding was required, and a lick of gloss black paint sorted things out and soon left both baseboards looking presentable and as good as new.

Our wiring on the Wisbech and Upwell is very simple, mainly due to the trackplan involved, so checking it won't take all that long. Dry joints, faulty plugs and choc blocks are all things to look out for in order to avoid headaches after setup at a show. In addition, cleaning the track with a liquid cleaning solution can ensure smooth running of locomotives and avoid abrasion to the surface of the track.

Once all work has been carried out, the last task at hand was to give all the trackwork a thorough clean with a track rubber to remove traces of hairspray and other deposits.



CREATING THE BACKSCENE





A few final words.

We feel the finished layout has been transformed and brought to life again. It only took a matter of a few hours and in the long term should last, we hope, for some time yet. Some further work remains on the locomotives and rolling-stock to bring them up to the same standard.

A competition will be held at the Warley and Peterborough shows for a chance to win this layout, further details will be announced at the shows.



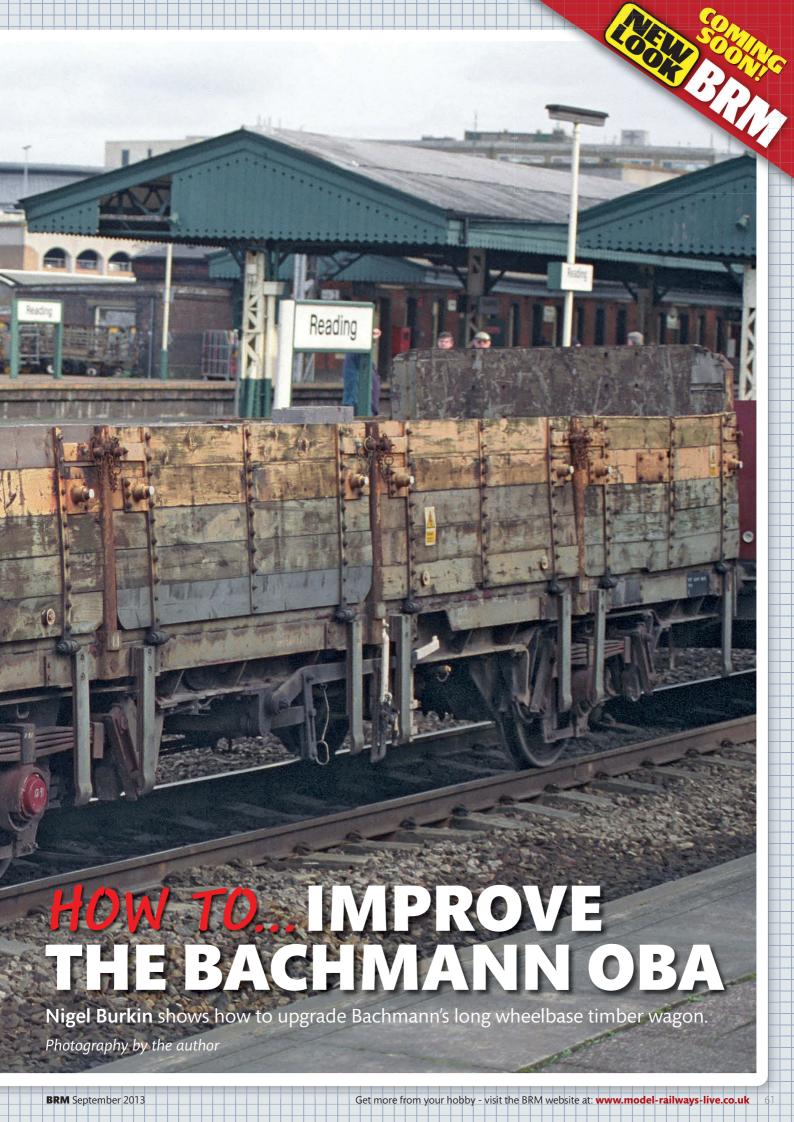
A visit to the 'Totally Thomas' stand at Market Deeping MRC's show last May resulted in the purchase of a Bachmann 'Thomas' Henrietta. This will make an excellent, though basic Wisbech and Upwell coach. The coach is easily dis-assembled with two screws, so look out for it re-appearing soon in weathered Maroon with appropriate number.

Visit Model-Railways Live soon to see how we modified it.

With the locomotive stud currently consisting of two Bachmann "Thomas' - based locos, there was an opportunity to add a more realistic item of rolling stock. A Bachmann Class 04 in black was obtained, together with the Craftsman kit for conversion of the Class 03 to 04 supplied by Howes. This kit contains the all-important earlier cab sides, but not the earlier cab front with square windows. While fitting all the details onto the 04, the body was also modified to take the current Bachmann Class 03 chassis - the wheels are slightly different but this will not be noticeable when the side skirts are on. Talking of which, the lack of the Impetus or Vulcan kit for the tramway version will lead to scratch-built sides and cowcatchers and this will appear on our website soon.

Practical BRV

The wagon as it comes...

A regular work bench task is modifying certain Bachmann wagon models representing modern air braked wagons to improve their reliability. I am referring to long wheelbase air braked wagons such as the OBA and OCA together with the VAA, VBA and VDA vans. They share a common underframe design, technically speaking, albeit with detail differences pertinent to the wagon design. For some reason, unknown to modellers, Bachmann chose to articulate the axle guards of these models as if they are single axle bogies, a physically impossible design for heavy rail operation. A nod towards train set design, it does little for the performance of the models in many regards, particularly when used on fine scale layouts. I have noted that continental model manufacturers such as Electrotren do not use this feature on long wheel base models of similar size. Why it has crept into UK model design is a mystery and completely unnecessary for a scale model.

The problems I have encountered include the inability to track smoothly through complex track work, particularly diamond crossings, as the articulated axle guards rotate in a manner not governed by track geometry. The axles fail to lead the wagon into curves correctly causing derailments. The floppy nature of the axle guard fitting also makes coupling and uncoupling during operation difficult because the couplings are mounted on the axle guard mouldings and not the underframe itself. When coupling two wagons of this type together, one

coupling might ride over or under the adjacent one. The operation of Kadees, which rely on good centring of the coupler is also impaired. A good cause for doing something about it!

A reliability upgrade to improve tracking and coupling performance is fairly easy to do and I have chosen a Bachmann OBA wagon to demonstrate the technique. Whilst undertaking the modifications to these models, I routinely convert them to EM gauge using new metal 12mm disc wheels which may be detailed with disc brake inserts if desired. I also fit Kadee couplers for delayed action uncoupling to suit layout operations. The couplings of the OBA and OCA models are fitted to NEM pockets which accept a Kadee NEM type coupler (either a No. 19 or No. 20 depending on how sharp the layout curves are) without difficulty. This is one feature that can be retained on the model.

To complete this one-hour work bench project, you will need a set of jeweller's screwdrivers, a good modelling knife with spare sharp blades, cutting mat on the table top, solvent cement and, if fitting Kadee couplers, a No. 205 or No. 206 coupler height gauge.

Making improvements

Turn the wagon upside down and remove the wheels from the axle guards – retain them if using the wagon on an OO gauge layout because they are perfectly good wheels! A cross head jewellers screwdriver is used to release the axle guard mouldings from the model. Each one has the coupling arm cut off by scoring a line across the arm close to the axle guards with a sharp modelling knife blade and snapping off. A little cleaning up is required. Back to the wagon underframe itself and the modelling knife is used to trim a millimetre or so from the

mounting spigots. This allows the axle guards to be screwed back into place tight against the floor of the underframe making the chassis rigid, as it should be! A spot of glue may be added to be sure that the axle guards are not going to move again Now refit the original wheels or new ones if desired.

Work still has to be done to fit frame mounted couplings whilst taking advantage of the NEM coupling pockets. A quick check with a Kadee height gauge shows that the coupling arms cut from the axle guard mouldings can be glued directly to the wagon floor and support a NEM pocket Kadee at the correct operating height. To use, simply place the gauge on a length of track and roll the wagon up to it. One end of the gauge has a flat surface to test the floor height of the wagon relative to the working height of Kadees. When using Kadees with draft gear boxes, such as the No. 146, this determines if any packing is required to fit the Kadee at the correct operating height.

In the case of our reliability upgrade job, a height gauge indicates that the NEM pocket moulding may be glued straight to the floor with minimal packing. Be sure that the pocket is fitted with the chosen Kadee first so its position relative to the buffers can be determined. Solvent cement can be used to secure the moulding to the plastic floor of the model. The Kadee must be positioned both on the centre line of the model and in such a manner that the back face of the knuckle is level with or in front of the buffer face. Once the coupling boxes are secure, the project is complete, with the wagon ready for service. Of course, a pristine OBA open wagon such as the one used to demonstrate this simple upgrade will warrant a little more work bench time to weather it al little!







The underframe is not rigid like the full size wagons because the axle guards are articulated. This feature can cause the wagon to derail when running through complex track work and when being propelled during shunting.



I modified this particular OBA to make the chassis rigid, equip it with No.19 Kadee couplers and EM gauge wheels.



The wheels and axle guard mouldings are removed from the underframe. Keep the wheels if modelling in OO gauge.



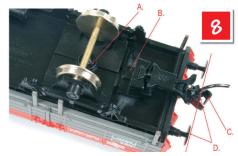
The NEM pocket arm (A), which is moulded as part of the axle guards so they rotate are removed. A line is scored across the arm (B) and the part separated from the axle guard moulding (C) ready for fixing to the wagon floor.



Ordinarily, that would complete the modifications to the axle guards if using the OO gauge wheels supplied with the model. Modellers working in EM and P4 will need to trim some plastic from the axle guard moulding to clear the wheels and this photograph shows a modified moulding on the left.



Trim the axle guard spigot by a millimetre or two to allow the mouldings to be screwed hard against the floor



Reassembly involves replacing the axle guards with their screws (A); gluing the coupling arms in place, directly to the underframe floor (B) in a position so that the back of the coupler knuckle (C) is forward of the buffer faces (D) to prevent buffer lock.



When freelance fitting Kadees or installing NEM coupling boxes for use with Kadees, always use a height gauge as demonstrated in this photograph. The No. 205 gauge has a metal body whilst the No. 206 has a plastic one suitable for use on DCC layouts where the metal gauge would cause a short circuit.



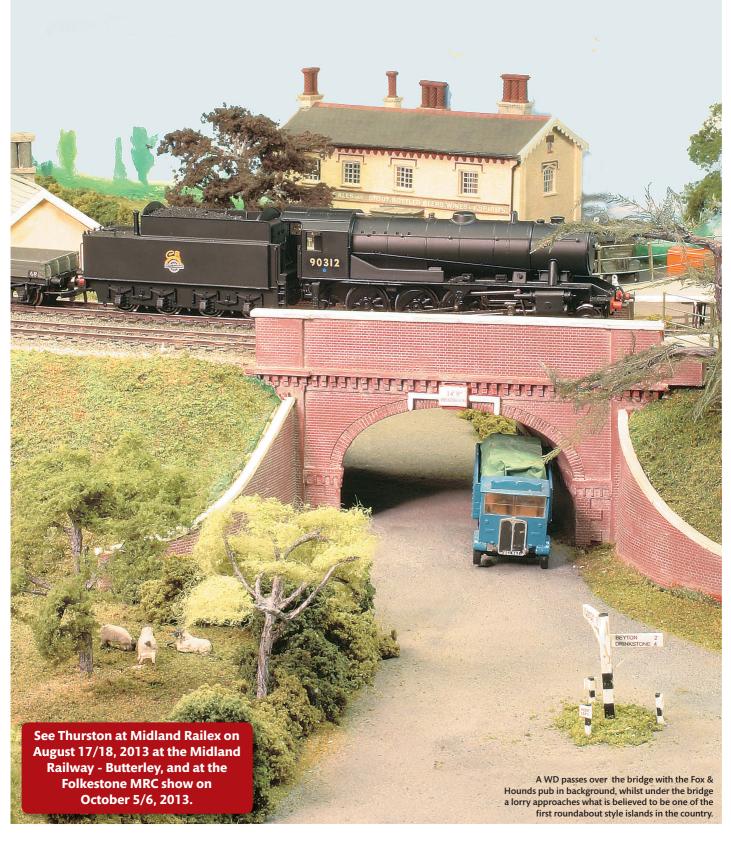
A rigid underframe and correctly mounted couplings improves the running of the Bachhmann OBA and OCA wagon beyond recognition, especially during shunting operations.



The project is completed - about an hour at the work bench to complete. Weathering and distressing of the wooden sides will follow.

THURSTON

hurston lies some four and half miles east of Bury St Edmunds on the Cambridge to Ipswich line and is a small Suffolk village. In 2013 it still has a railway station, albeit an un-staffed halt and is served by trains of the Abellio, Greater Anglia franchise and has around 19 trains a day in each direction. On Sunday there are eight in each direction.

The line was built by the Ipswich & Bury Railway Company and opened for goods traffic on November 30, 1846. The first public passenger train left Ipswich for Bury St. Edmunds at 9.10am on Christmas Eve, 1846. Frederick Barnes of Ipswich was the architect, who won the design contract for the majority of intermediate stations between Bury and Ipswich: (Bramford) Clayden, Needham, Stowmarket, (Haughley Road), Elmswell and Thurston. Thurston station buildings are set on a high embankment and consists of two and a half storey buildings constructed with local red bricks with white stock bricks used decoratively on the corners and around door and window openings. The period modelled is 1950 -1960 and the region is BR Eastern Region.

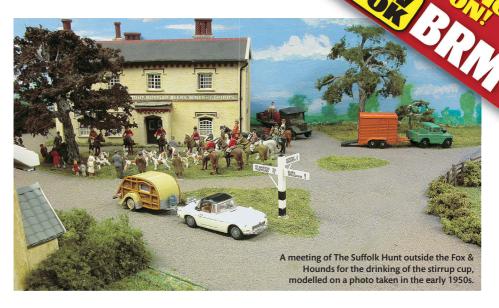
Layout build

Construction of the layout was carried out using the tried and tested methods of 2" x 1" leg framing system onto which the 12 baseboards of timber and plywood sit.

Wiring of the layout was made for a cab control system for four Gaugemaster or KPC hand-held controllers (Up, Down, yard and fiddle yard) with identical plug and socket connectors between every board.

Track is Peco code 100 ballasted with a mixture of silver sand and granite. 'Electro-frog' points are fitted with H&M point motors, which also switch the polarity on the 'Electo-frog' points.

The running signals are kit-built from the Model Signal Engineering range and are made as a drop-in module (removable during transportation) and fitted with the signal



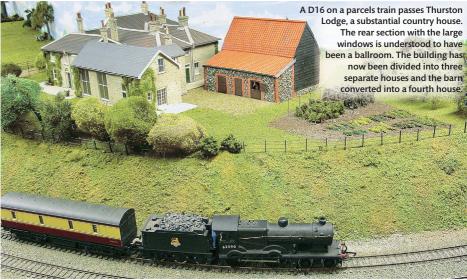

actuator motor from MSE. The ground signals are GER rotating type and also from the MSE range and are permanently mounted and operated with a push rod mechanism (if the yard operator remembers!).

Buildings are all scratch-built and modelled as closely as possible on the prototypes using a variety of materials, eg: Exactoscale, Slater's, Wills, plastic card, etc. We display a set of actual and model photos at exhibitions to show how we have tried to capture the atmosphere and specific details of buildings, many of which have changed significantly over the last 50-60 years.

Setting the period

As well as modelling the scenery on the actual buildings to paint a picture of Thurston station and its immediate surroundings, we very much wanted to capture the 1950's period way of life and to model the road vehicles, trains and locomotives that would have been seen at that time.

In our experience many of the visitors to exhibitions, whilst appreciative of good modelling, scenery, rolling stock and cameo scenes, actually want to see trains running to capture and keep their attention. To do this on Thurston we try to run the trains that would have been seen, but not to a specific timetable as we have found over the years that this can

be constricting. For example, if one operator is having a problem the other operators can keep trains moving without waiting for a connection. We appreciate this may not be prototypical but feel an exhibition layout is also for entertainment as well as being a historical miniature recreation.

It is most rewarding when operating to see people coming back to watch Thurston several times during a show. To add to the movement we generally try to have a train shunting in the goods yard, using a very small head shunt, whilst in reality it would have been using the main line, but again this would interfere with the running of the main lines and the small headshunt does present the yard operator with a challenge and stops them falling asleep!

Locomotives and stock

The club has made two dedicated pick-up goods trains with all stock weathered and the two locos fitted with Spratt & Winkle couplings for automatic uncoupling by magnets when shunting the yard. The Spratt & Winkle couplings work well with the uncoupling magnets placed under the track and a dash of paint on the track (on the inside, away from the public view so only the yard operator can see where they are). With the aid of mirrors placed on the lighting facia it is possible for the operator to see all of the yard without getting a permanent crick in the neck.

In 1952 the Working Time Table shows how railway traffic had developed over the years, with the following trains passing through Thurston (see Table 2). Express trains included 'The North Country Continental', which ran between Liverpool Central and Harwich, for passengers using the sea ferry route between Harwich and the Hook of Holland. Also services to and from Peterborough, York and Newcastle, the overnight services between Colchester and Scotland together with the overnight East Anglian Travelling Post Office.

Just over a quarter of the freight services ran to and from Parkeston (Quay) at Harwich where goods were loaded onto or from merchant shipping as either exports or imports. The majority of all freight services ran to or from the large Whitemoor marshalling yard at March. The local goods were delivered to, or collected from Thurston by local pick-up goods services working between Bury-Stowmarket/ Ipswich. A full article on the history of Thurston station can be found on the club website (www. app-ltd.com/elymrc). There were ferry wagons often seen in the trains on the line having come from or going to Europe via the train ferry between Harwich-Zeebrugge.

Most of the Down freight trains ran as Class F whilst most of the Up trains ran as Class E, and to show the head codes we have fitted most of our model locomotives with small lamp irons (usually off cut Bambi staples) so that lamps can be correctly fitted to show the appropriate head code for the class of train.

A study of engine shed allocations and photographs from the time revealed that most of the locomotives seen were GER or LNER type with WD, 'Britannias' and early diesel types towards the end of the decade (see loco stud list on previous page, Table 1).

As well as passenger, parcels and general freight we have also made some specific trains to add to the variety and for two of them to be

reversed into the layby siding to allow faster trains to pass them. The Engineer's train is made up of an old Hornby Gresley sleeping coach, suitable painted, weathered and lettered, the small travelling crane is also from Hornby, again repainted and weathered and the excellent new 'Shark' brake van is from Hornby.

The sleeper wagons are the 'Grampus' kits from Craftsman Models, the rail carriers are the old Mainline 'Bogie Bolster C' wagons, with rusted rail and fine chain added. The drop side ballast wagons are old Tri-ang wagons, rewheeled and repainted; altogether not too challenging a train for the writer, a modeller of limited ability.

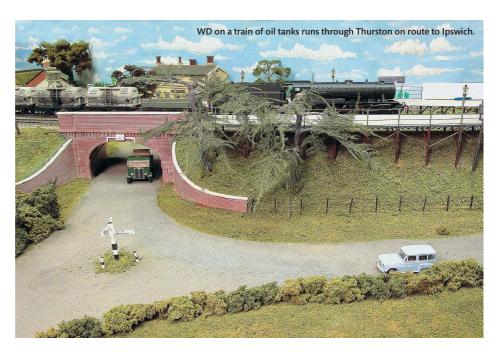
Jonathan Weallans made the weed killing train. The Chipman Chemical Company was formed in 1929 and provided a spray train service, spraying weeds on railways throughout the United Kingdom, also supplying specialist weed control products and services to Local Authorities and the industrial market. They provided a treatment train for the LNER before the war and continued railway work until the early 1990s. This train, utilising a converted GE brake van and a string of tanks containing the water-based 'Atlacide' weedkiller, was in use until the mid-1950s when it was replaced by more modern equipment. The train was made up mainly from customised Bachmann tank wagons and kit-built brake vans. Danny Pinnock of D&S kindly supplied a kit for the GE brake van with suitable fittings. Pictures of the tank wagons were almost impossible to locate and both details and transfers were reconstituted using what little information was available. The transfers were produced by Brunel Models in Australia. Photographs were found in 55 Years of East Anglian Steam by Dr. Ian C Allen (Plate 206), and Odd Corners of the Eastern by Eric Sawford (p85).

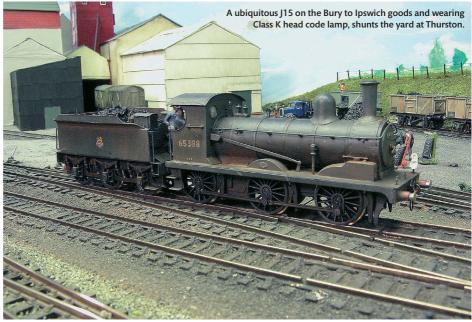
Rolling stock

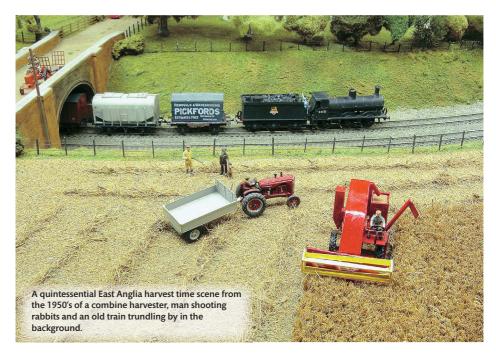
Jonathan also built most of the international rolling stock which ran on the Parkeston Quay -March Whitemoor services. The LNER initiated the train ferry service between Harwich and Zeebrugge in 1924 in concert with the Belgian state railways. Continental railways soon provided specially built stock for the UK loading gauge and these soon began to flow from Harwich to Whitemoor and thence onwards throughout Britain. So far the train consists of a number of Italian (FS) refrigerated vans of various similar types which were built from 1931 onwards. These were used to carry fruit, vegetables and cheese from Italy. They were chilled by filling compartments at each end with blocks of ice through the small doors at each upper end.

The train also includes two German vans of a

EXTRACTS FROM THE RULE BOOK

Rule 119: Each engine, or leading engine when two or more engines are coupled together, and each rail motor, motor train, or electric train, or push and pull train, must carry the prescribed head lamps, discs or indicators and destination boards where provided. The head lamps and indicators must be alight after sunset and during fog or falling snow, and where otherwise specified.

Rule 122: (a) An engine without a train must, except as provided for in Rule 154 (b), when on any running line, always carry a tail lamp in the rear. (b) When two or more engines are run coupled together without a train, the last engine only must have a tail lamp attached. (c) An engine or engines drawing a train must not carry any lamp in the rear. (d) An engine assisting a train in the rear must have a tail lamp attached; when more than one engine assists, the tail lamp must be carried on the rearmost engine only.

Rule 123: Engines employed exclusively in shunting at stations and yards must, after sunset or during fog or falling snow, carry one red and one white light, both at front and rear, one over each buffer.

Rule 154 (b): If the engine after being uncoupled leaves the train or a portion thereof ahead of the signal controlling the entrance of trains into the section in advance, it must not carry a tail lamp... Where vehicles are left in rear of the signal controlling the entrance of trains into the section in advance, a tail lamp must be carried on the engine.

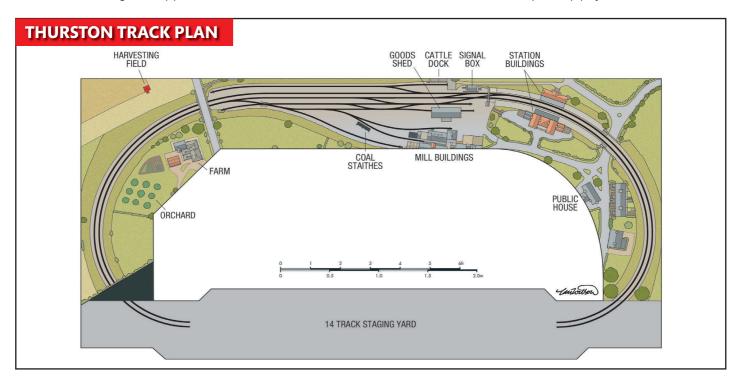

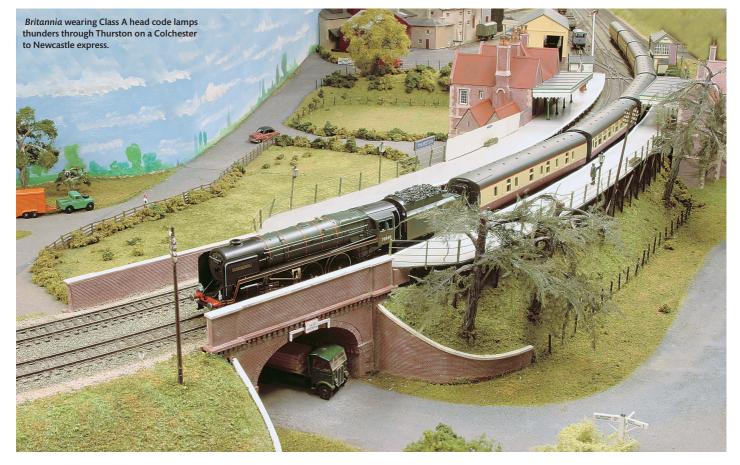
type known as 'Saarbrucken' after the station to which they were to be returned. These have the typical Continental brakeman's hut and illustrate the larger, longer designs of van which Europe adopted many years before British railways. These bear labels showing they are bringing parts from the McCormick International tractor factory (thanks to McCormick for their assistance). By way of a contrast the train also includes an ex-Southern van built for the Dover train ferry service which started in 1936. Although five or so years newer than the German vans, the design is many years older.

The train was inspired by an lan C Allen photograph which we have endeavoured to recreate as far as available information allows; further additions including Belgian, French, Spanish and possibly Hungarian and Greek vehicles are planned. All the vehicles bar the SR van are scratch-built in 'Plastikard' and Evergreen plastics, with suitably altered proprietary components used for brake gear and other details. Buffers were sourced from the SNCF Society and German Railway Society, while the transfers were produced by Precision Labels via their excellent custom service. The

photo referenced above is published in *Doctor* on the Line by Dr. Ian C Allen.

* For anyone who wants a more lasting memory of this beautiful corner of Suffolk in the 1950s, a widescreen DVD of Thurston OO is available, professionally produced by our Club Chairman, for purchase at a modest charge at exhibitions that we attend. Available in Standard or High Definition, all proceeds go to the Club to help support our modelling efforts. Thrapston (Midland) in Northants is our current OO gauge 'roundy-roundy' project.





Practical BRV

HOW TO ... SUPER-DETAIL A BACHMANN 'DELTIC'



Having previously detailed a OO gauge Bachmann 'Deltic', **Jonathan Hughes** now sets himself the task of producing a P4 version using Shawplan's Extreme Etchings. *Photography by the author.*

couple of years ago I attempted a little scratch-build detailing and weathering project to add some improvements to the Bachmann Class 55 'Deltic'; it's a nice model but one whose tooling is now a little dated, allowing some room for improvement, but then again, that's what modelling is all about isn't it? My efforts were explained and illustrated in the January and February 2012 issues of *BRM*.

Shortly after this project was completed, the long awaited range of detailing parts from Shawplan's 'Extreme Etchings' range became available, which prompted me to consider a more thorough conversion.

So, it was time to remove another model

from the safety of its box, gather the plethora of materials and parts and start again.

It's probably fair to say that this is one of those projects that grew as it progressed, probably as a result of seeing room for further improvement as adjacent details were tackled; it started with an intent to use just a small selection of the range of etched items, but gradually I used almost all of them with just the confidence of a complete novice stopping me from attempting the most complex items such as the superb cant rail grilles and the replacement resin noses. Clearly there will never be commercially available items for everything, so there was still some opportunity for scratch-built details. So, whilst the project

possibly fell a little short of what could have been fully achieved, I am more than happy with the final result.

I've tried here to provide a brief summary of the areas tackled during the conversion, covering changes to the bodywork, the chassis and the bogies.

It's always important to use the right glue. I'm in no position to define which is right in each instance, but those that I found that worked for me included various cyanoacrylates including Zapa-a-gap (thin/pink and medium/green), Rocket Max, and a non-blooming variety. I also employed some Glue 'n' Glaze when a subtle touch was needed and Johnsons Klear for some of the latterly fitted etched components and the glazing.



Bodywork

Given the age of the model, the shape is reasonably accurate, the cab taper looks right and the roof panels aren't bad either. The overall body profile is accurate, but there is room for improvement at the nose ends and the details can benefit from refinement with some of the fine etched components.

The top of the bonnet slopes too steeply towards the nose and this needs some vigorous re-profiling with a file and various grades of paper, flattening out the upper surface and gently curving the sides to match the prototype. This allows the windscreen pillar to deepen too. Of course, this removes the moulded bonnet top doors, but there's a fine replacement for these, comprising a three-part etch with a brass base and two nickel steel door pieces that can be added with just the slightest of overhang and a slight gap between them.

As I was modelling a 1974 machine, the sandbox filler covers could be added using fine etched parts which are rolled to match the nose profile and the

'punched' rivet detail. To fit these flush, holes were made in the relevant locations using the drill-out and file technique. The bodyside sandbox covers were fitted in a similar manner.

The nose filler covers identified that the tail lamp housings were undersize and on being unable to source a scale replacement, I made some new lamp housings using sections of plastic rod, brass wire and 'Microstrip'. It was a fiddly, but worthwhile change.

The nose end step recess was also drilled out, as the one on the model is a little shallow. This can then be shaped and closed off with a thin plastic card plate on the inside face.

The headboard bracket mouldings (those just inboard of the marker light housings) were also replaced with the most intricate etched brackets I'd handled yet; folded up carefully these were fitted into holes drilled through the nose end in the space vacated by the originals.

The nose ends are improved further by widening the bufferbeam opening and substituting replacement buffers; I chose the

Hornby Class 50 buffers and to these the checkerplate step surface and access covers were added. The new buffers were inserted into widened holes in place of the existing buffer shanks. The buffers can be improved with the etched buffer back plate,.

All handrails were replaced with 0.4mm wire and the lower ones were repositioned slightly outboard of their original locations which weren't quite right. A fine etched upper lamp bracket was used to replace the plastic article. but prior to fitting, representations of the reinforcing plate bolt heads were fitted using short lengths of 0.6 mm wire fitted into new holes drilled in the necessary locations; the lengths of wire left protruding are then filed down leaving about 0.5mm proud. The bracket can then be bent to shape, with the light rivet detail punched through and then inserted into the original location. It should be noted that this bracket will suit all but the last loco in the fleet; for some reason D9021 had a different shape bracket.



The nose intake traction motor cooler grilles comprise a two-part etch and a single template. The existing grilles can be drilled and filled away using the protruding frame to help keep the hole straight.

A template can be used to check squareness, before the original surround is filed and sanded flush. The inner grille is folded to slot in to this hole, leaving very small tabs onto which the outer piece sits. Once the holes were all cut, and subject to trial installation as shown, the pieces were put away for later installation.

The brake exhausters access hatch etch can be added in the same location as the marked-out panel. The edges of this are very fine and need careful fixing with thin glue such as Zap-a-Gap pink.

At the same time, it's worth looking at the fire-pull handle surrounds. The raised lip of the circular panel is in the wrong place at the No.1 end (the one with the brake exhausters hatch), unless you were to model D9007, in which case it's in the right place. I wasn't, so I replaced this with a sliver of plastic tube - an etched part is available, but I'd forgotten to buy one.

The jacking points can be enhanced by adding etched plates, I also made hooks to attach the body-to-bogie shackles. I fitted these plates flush, removing some of the plastic carefully with a sharp blade and a burr tool. Again, careful attention to reference photos is important to get the depths correct and to ensure that the right etched part used, there being two standards. Prior to fitting the plates, a small piece of wire, shaped to represent a hook, was attached through a small hole in the body; the bogie to body shackles will attach to this later. A 0.25mm wire loop enables the functionality of the hook to be verified. The etched handbrake levers can then be bent to shape and fitted into a drilled/cut slot just forward of each of these.

Etched windscreen frames were added to the existing screen holes and then I replaced the moulded cab footstep surrounds, filing these flush and fully drilling out the footstep in the same manner as the nose end step.

The new cab step surrounds can be fitted once the rows of rivets have been punched out; I used a blunt pin tapped gently into the recesses in the rear surface. Chequer plate is added to the step surfaces, with a little plastic padding under the lower step to get the desired depth.

The holes for the engine air intake grilles were cut through the existing mouldings, using the template and the same technique used for the nose intake traction motor cooler grilles. Once complete, it is possible to add etched water tank filler hatches which are not represented on the Bachmann models; oddly enough these do appear on some Lima models. Both the hatches and riveted covers are available as etches. For my model, I needed the riveted covers, which I recessed into a square hole, and on one side, the catches were made using 0.4mm wire inserted, cut to length and bent over after the panels had been fitted.

The Extreme Etchings range includes fine exhaust ports, and these can be glued in place over the thinned down moulded ones. Because D9020 (and D9021) went into service without the original water boiler exhaust, the roof

panels on these locos lacked the thin oblongshaped cover over the unused exhaust. This is represented on the Bachmann model, so it needs to be carefully removed for either of the last two locos.

A replacement for the fan grilles is a must! There are two versions, the early coarse or later fine mesh. To fit these, I removed the model's inner lip in the hole, and then carefully attached the base mesh using the thin Zap-a-Gap to tack this into position before using more of the glue to bleed through the mesh to the plastic to secure it in place. The ring was then shaped to fit and added on top of the mesh, strengthening it.

The walkway frames are glued in place using the small tabs, with the walkway plates added once you've checked which walkways you need, some locos had different arrangements early on, although a standard arrangement of a single plate was common later on.

When new, that last three locos had roof mounted horns. Whilst these were later moved, the original mounting bolts and shrouds were retained; 55019 still has these today. 0.2mm wire lengths were fitted in pre-drilled holes, noting the staggered position of the originals

Further body fittings included scratch-built ETS modules. The upper of these can be fitted to an etched top-hat section mounting plate; the lower modules were fitted to small platforms glued into the body bottom corners, underneath the rear of the buffer housings. The modules were made from a selection of plastic rod, plastic card and 'Microstrip', with a piece of 0.4mm wire to represent the lead. A flexible material could have been used, but once assembled there's no need for this to move and the brass wire lead can be shaped permanently and painted/weathered with no concerns of paint flaking.

Once the lower ETS modules have been fitted, etched bufferbeam steps can be folded and added into the extreme corners on the bodywork.

Further details included the fitting of etched data plates, some short lengths of 0.6mm wire to represent the windscreen washer jets and some 0.2mm wire to represent the horn air hoses. The cab door handrail mouldings were also replaced with some 0.4mm wire attached through small holes drilled into the sides of the door surrounds, fiddly but worth the effort.

Cab details

I found suitable prototype photos and constructed the two bulkheads to fit within the constraints of the available space.

The cab instrument panel isn't good, so again with reference to prototype photos the original shape was modified and panels added, onto which the small controls were placed using plastic card and wire and a handbrake wheel added. Dials were cut using a drill bit, making sure the right number were added; the original had five dials on the driver's panel, but it would need six for an airbrake fitted loco.

Buffer beam

Whilst the Bachmann buffer-beam isn't bad, there is a fine etched buffer-beam, constructed from pieces that are bent and jointed to provide a robust unit beam that will firmly anchor to the loco chassis and allow use of a working screw coupling. Because the new piece is 'to scale', a trial fit showed the need for some paring of the outer edges to avoid fouling the inner parts of the buffer units. This was because I retained the

original nose with its scale inaccuracies; replacing the entire section with a new resin nose would improve this.

Whilst Shawplan offers a number of really nice cast white metal pipes, I decided to try constructing some from wire, and make use of some spare Heljan parts, that are available from Howes; in this, pipework from their 47 and *Kestrel* proved very useful. I also refined some of the existing Bachmann pipes with some fine wire and added some train brake pipe suspending chains made from twisting some fine fuse wire. Leaving one pipe dangling improved the look. Beam interconnecting pipes were made from a selection of wire sizes, and the brake exhauster pipes from 0.6mm wire. An Exactoscale working screw coupling completed the assembly.

Chassis and fuel tanks

The profile of the fuel tanks is wrong. The protruding lower lip shouldn't be as pronounced as it is on the model (interestingly an error recently duplicated by Heljan in O and OO gauges), and filing this back while gouging out a seam goes a long way to correcting this.

Before working on the fuel tank details, I removed enough material to accept a bassreflex speaker. Detail work involved removing the webbing material between the tank and chassis; adding extra pipework between the tanks and chassis; replacing the fuel filler cap mouldings and relocating one as it's in the wrong place for a later loco - the two sides are not symmetrical - fitting wire and plastic card valve pieces between the tanks with small etch fret brackets; replacing the moulded fuel gauges with etched items that finished off a reworked gauge surround; using Archer 3D transfers to represent rivet detail (added after first paint application); and, adding fuel and oil drain pipes at the tank ends.

Bogies

There are rather a large number of improvements to make to the bogies, and these changes only affect the cast bogies rather than the early fabricated units which had a tendency to crack in service. Changes made were: replacing the existing brake cylinders with those from a Hornby Class 50 bogie with 0.25mm nickel wire pipework; drilling out the lever actuator holes; adding a small 0.2mm wire hook to 'hook' the brake chain to; replacing the front nudge bars with those of the Hornby class 50 bogie (not spectacular, but good enough); adding shaped wire 'hooks' to the tie bar shrouds; reshaping the bogie outer frame ends and attaching etched towing eye brackets; fitting etched cab steps with a kick plate on one and attached using plastic card brackets; making and fitting a speedo sensor and cabling to the No.2 bogie, made using plastic rod, plastic card and 0.6mm and 0.25mm wire to provide the connection between the two hubs; providing a speedo cable interface to the body with Shirring elastic; making a mileage recorder from plastic card, fitted to the rear axle of the No.1 bogie.

To get the body to sit on the bogies properly, with the impression of its 102 tonne weight, it is necessary to reduce the bogie ride height. Heljan achieved a good result with their recent DP2, and a similar effect can be achieved with this model, by removing material at the top of the bogie tower.

Finally, having gone to all of this effort, I

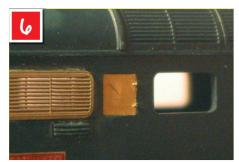

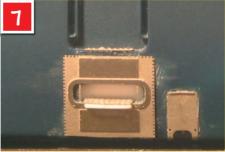

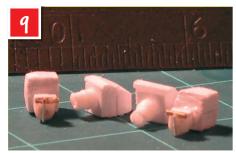

decided to use a P4 gauge wheelset, thus providing some accurate flange dimensions and a correct gauge, whilst putting the wheels at the right distance from the bogie frames. Whilst this opened up all sorts of new problems that I'd not thought about facing (constructing the permanent way for one), it would enable a more realistic impression to be achieved, and as this was what I was aiming for, it was worth the change.

An overview shows what had been achieved at this stage, before some bufferbeam refinement and fuel tank work. But the feel of the loco was beginning to be felt, although clearly I was still undecided over what to put in the train reporting panel, reverting here briefly to the domino panel of my childhood.

Finishing and final details

Final details were added to the model after painting. The body was treated to a coat of Halfords grey primer and then the nose-ends were given a few light coats of Railmatch white primer with the airbrush to provide a better base for the yellow. The chassis, bufferbeams and bogie were treated to a similar light coating of Halfords red primer, followed by a few light coats of Railmatch weathered black with the airbrush. Pipework details and fans were then picked out in the appropriate colour whilst accessible as separate components.

As this was my first loco repaint, I used a pair of old Lima GUV bodies to practice on. All parts are shown here ready for some colour.

I applied a few light coats of Railmatch Warning panel Yellow (Pre -'84) to the ends, building up the colour density slowly, allowing this to dry for a few days.

After some careful masking, my first attempt at applying the blue top coat was unsuccessful. However, with encouragement and the assistance of members of RMweb, I became familiar with the art of paint stripping and was able to bring the model back to primer and have a second attempt, which was much more successful. A case of 'if at first you don't succeed...' For the successful top coat I airbrushed a few light coats of Railmatch BR blue, which I then left to dry and harden before going any further.

With the basic finish complete, details were

picked out in the appropriate colour, making good use of Railmatch enamels.

Decals were a mix of waterslide from Modelmaster for the BR arrows, Fox Transfers for the TOPS numbers and Precision decals for the class data labels.

While the majority of my memories were of 'Deltic's with the 'domino' headcode, I liked the idea of a good four-digit code. I believe that my first 'Deltic' journeys would have been behind some of the 9000s, but I don't recall any detail. In 1974, the TOPS numbering was introduced to the class, and most locos held on to their train reporting codes for the rest of the year. So, with a representation of a loco in 1974 condition, I could have both the four digit code and TOPS numbering. Given some memories of Nimbus storming through Finsbury Park, the loco would be 55 020. Reference to the 1974 timetable and that veritable reference site (www.napierchronicles.co.uk), I found some codes that I considered meaningful, representative, and looked nice: 1S17 and 1E05: the Down and Up 'Flying Scotsman'. I decided to fit the Precision Labels digits individually so that their common 'wonky' appearance could be replicated; sticking each to the existing plastic inner, which was then pushed into the glazed frame. Some Extreme Etchings headcode frames were fitted using some Klear.

Additional final details included fitting the shirring elastic sanding pipes; on the bogies these elastic parts were secured with a loop of 0.2mm wire, whilst the other end was passed through a new hole drilled through the plastic chassis. A drop of glue secured the outer pipes at the correct angle representing the correct routing for an ETS fitted loco.

Brake chains were fitted onto the previously fitted levers, and some new Laserglaze flush panels were fitted to the bodyside windows. These last items were secured in place with some Klear after which the window surrounds can be attached in the same manner. Because I'd not used the full windscreen etched parts, I polished the original screens and fitted these back in; they fitted fine. The cab side windows are quite good, and a little paint in the right place enhances these nicely.

The final detail was to add the body to bogie shackles, details rarely modelled. I used a small wire jig and then wrapped 0.2mm wire to make the shackle; a small figure-of-eight shape is formed with wrapping around the middle. The shackle is fitted to the hook behind the lifting

point cover and over the bogie hook once assembled. A small touch of flexible glue behind the lifting cover will stop these dropping out when you're not looking; a lesson that was leant the hard way.

Weathering

Just enough weathering was applied to make the loco look realistic - like a worked loco, but not uncared for; this was after all a Finsbury Park thoroughbred. Given that the body paint and varnish applied to seal the decals was fully hardened, the usual technique of airbrushing some brown shades and then lifting these with a white spirit dampened cotton bud was applied. I think that I covered this in more detail in my previous article, when I first set about weathering these models, so a repeat here probably isn't necessary. I prefer to use enamels because they give you a little more working time; for this, I find the quick drying of acrylics a disadvantage, but I accept that not everyone agrees with this opinion; I think it's just good to find a technique that works for you.

All lower surfaces, including the bufferbeams and tumblehome, were given a final dusting to represent 'recent grime' over the previously applied and removed paint.

Because I'd not replaced the cantrail grilles, these were treated to several coats of very thin black, which seeped into the recesses. Clearly the replacement etched grilles would be better, but I think the effect I received is reasonable. The roof was treated with some dirty greys (roof dirt and weathered black) to simulate exhaust grime, with the cab roof 'wiped' clean away from the centrel ine. Finally, some Tamiya weathering pastels were used to represent oil 'throw' from the exhausts, with the resultant sheen toned down with a light dusting from the airbrush.

The chassis and bogies also received a light dusting of the same brown 'grime' that had been applied to the body tumblehome; the bogies also received some colour variation with the weathering pastels, which was then blended with a thinners-moistened brush. The thin black paint was used within the springs to deepen the shadows and add a few 'moisture runs' on the body, fuel tanks and bogies. After assembly, the chassis and body was blended further with the airbrush adding more grime and a lighter colour to represent some brake dust build-up.

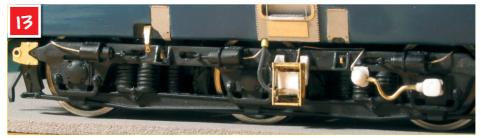
The finished item is, in my opinion, well worth the effort. It might be considered a complicated process to improve on what is already a reasonably good model, and if you had a full fleet of these, to modify 22 of them might be considered quite ambitious; although I know of at least one person attempting this. I, on the other hand, am quite content to have this as a representation of the class, which, I think withstands reasonably close scrutiny and looks the part.

Throughout the exercise, the membership of RMweb was on hand to buoy me up when things were going well and to offer support and advice when problems were encountered; and there were one or two problems for which the solution was only ever a few keyboard clicks away; thanks guys. I must also thank Brian Hanson, the designer and creator of the etched parts used within this project; his suggestions and encouragement throughout this project were very supportive. Would I repeat this project, and create another detailed member of the class? Yes, I will; although I will probably seek a simpler project first.

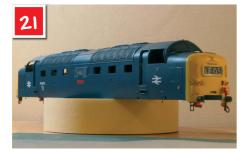

HOW TO... BUILD THE YORK MODELMAKING FOOTBRIDGE

BRM Staff Writer **Howard Smith** assembles the latest offering from York Modelmaking; a laser-cut footbridge.

pon visiting the York Model Making website, I must admit that at a first glance I was somewhat taken by surprise at the sheer quality of the finished models that are on show. It then became apparent that these people are professionals and take commissions for scale accurate and detailed models for large construction projects, landscape and building

architects, and all of this with pride. This is reflected in the attention to detail in parts, as in more recent times they have seen the utility of producing 'one-off' pieces to help scratch builders and kit builders alike during their projects.

One particular model which grabbed my attention when browsing the site a couple of months ago was their footbridge kit, priced at

the time at £38.50.

As duly promised, a sample of this model arrived on my desk only a couple of days after calling them, and it is in this article that I shall share with you how I assembled, painted and weathered the kit, not least forgetting to share with you its upsides and downsides.

Building the kit

The kit consists of several laser cut sheets of white Rowmark plastic. Rowmark is merely a type of plastic not dissimilar to styrene and shares most of its properties, however has the ability to withstand the high temperatures of laser cutting and engraving without melting the surrounding plastic.

All of the parts were easily separated from their respective sprues using a sharp knife and very little cleaning of parts was needed. The small tags left behind can easily be removed using a small needle file and I did run the file



over the cut surfaces of the parts so as to remove the 'lip' left behind by the laser. You could to some extent get away with this if you so wished, as it was only very thin and virtually naked to the human eye, but paint may have accumulated here later on.

I also used another of York Model Making's new products; 'Magnetic Mates'. These are quite simply no nonsense rare earth magnetics encased in 90° plastic angles which can be used in a variety of positions to hold parts together to be glued.

I proceeded to glue all parts using EMA 'Plastic Weld', a strong solvent adhesive which evaporates very quickly and uses capillary action to seep into the joints to be glued, however, the kit instructions do suggest that most solvent glues can be used to assemble this kit.

Room for improvement?

So, how did the parts fit together? Well, I'm being perfectly honest here; reasonably well, but there is still a little room for improvement. Gone are the days when etched brass kits had to be drawn by hand, then photocopied and blown up or reduced on a photocopier to attempt to achieve something that looked OK from a distance. With laser cutting techniques combined with CAD software, one could presume that all parts can be made to fit perfectly with only a minimum amount of cleaning to be had. Not so. Each step (of which there are 36) I found had to be trimmed to fit into its appropriate slot. The slots for the steps are too small or the locating tabs are too big, either way, none fit. Luckily, it can be easily overcome by a little trimming and filing of each step

For better fitting joints, a little extra overhang wouldn't go a miss and this could easily address the gap in the butt-joining of the steps to the end of the overpass. Again, nothing difficult to amend with a little styrene suitably glued in place.

One advantage with CAD drawing is that corrections and alterations can be made quite easily, and none of these glitches with the kit prevent it from looking like anything else other than a footbridge; however it could turn what is currently an enjoyable kit to build whilst still accessible to beginners, into what could arguably be one on a par with other etched kits currently available.

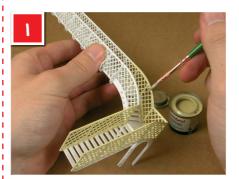
PREPARING AND PAINTING THE FINISHED FOOTBRIDGE

One advantage of having a kit which makes use of tab and slot construction is the speed at which it can be assembled; things invariably tend to line up better. But advantages are sometimes met with slight inconveniences, and all of those little slot holes are going to need to be filled in before we even contemplate going anywhere near that tin of paint.

I made life easy and made use of some Humbrol model filler that I had lying around on my office desk (as you do). No mixing is required; it is simply used neat, straight from the tube. Drying time does vary on the quantity applied, but in a few hours it had hardened due to the little amount used.

I settled on using Humbrol enamel paints, something that is a personal favourite, but acrylics would be just as suitable to such a task.

- 1. An overall thin coat of Humbrol matt 103 was applied evenly by brush.
- 2. Once dry this was then coated with Humbrol White wash, leaving a faded white appearance.
- 3. The bridge is left to air dry overnight before further work is carried out.
- 4. Parts of the footbridge were picked out in green (matt 76) as per many prototypes.
- **5.** Admittedly, the lines are quite tricky to get straight without masking, as there are no raised parts.
- **6.** Time to make things a little grubby; Humbrol black wash is applied to the steps and dry brushed on the sides of the footbridge.
- 7. The completed and weathered footbridge. Note the steps picked out in white and yellow. A nice addition to a modern image layout.



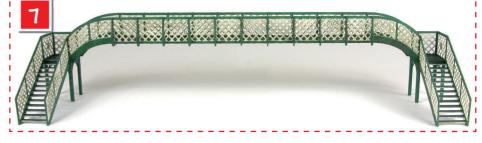
















I wanted something that would make this particular footbridge a little different from the rest and so a glance at the plethora of Health and Safety signs which now adorn so many of the railway infrastructures nationwide led me to be a little creative.

Five minutes with Photoshop later, and I had conjured up a 'Mind the steps' sign, which, I have witnessed in use on the footbridge at Penmaenmawr in North Wales. These were subsequently printed on a laser printer to a height of five millimetres each. Superglue was the preferred choice of glue for applying them to the footbridge sides.









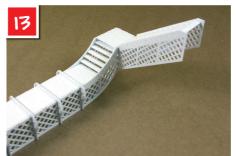
The kit once un-packed. Some five sheets make up the kit. The steps are provided loose in a plastic bag.



A dry-run with both sides of the bridge in place. Once made up into this structure the bridge becomes surprisingly strong.



A sharp scalpel or cutter makes short work of the plastic, the pre-grooved lines in the sides act as guides.



This bit was possibly the only 'tricky' part so to speak with the kit; fitting the steps. Filing the corners to a 45° mitre helped and with a bit of fettling it all turns out fine. Just double check that everything is square.



The footbridge supports are put together in a matter of seconds. Footbridge posts are invariably cast poles on the prototypes, however, this kit not being based on any particular style or location has allowed the manufacturer some freelance design to be had.



Making use of what is available on the market: York Model Making's Magnet Mates are an ideal way of holding tricky parts together for when gluing.



The entire kit was glued using one of my favourite glues for plastic: EMA Plastic Weld. Applied with a brush this glue dries very rapidly and leaves a strong joint.



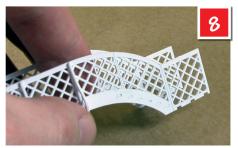
Magnetic Mates dimensions vary depending on which set you purchase, but these smaller sized magnets are ideal for compact areas and are just as powerful as their larger cousins.



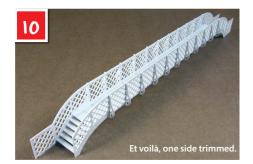
Gluing the under frame girders in place. No need to hold the parts being glued in place for long - such is the advantage of Plastic Weld.



Cleaning up the parts before assembly. A quick runover with a needle file removes the odd burr. This is as expected with most plastic kits.

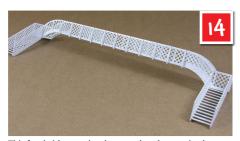


This footbridge can be assembled with the steps perpendicular to its span, either side, or, with steps parallel to the span. One side has to be trimmed to allow for the positioning of the steps.







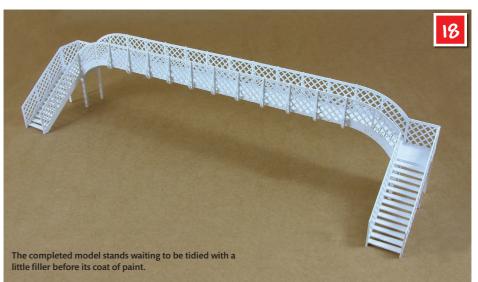


This footbridge can be shortened to the required length. Seen here in its full four track span length, a minimum one track span could also be achieved.



Once underneath the bridge span, the supports make all the difference. Time for a final check before gluing to make sure that all is square, just to be on the safe side.

Letter of the month

N gauge standards

think Ian Casey has missed the point regarding the presence of N gauge layouts (May 2013 BRM). It's not their existence that is in doubt, but their quality. I'm sure this will ruffle a few feathers, but it is said more in sorrow than anger, and I fully concede that people should be free to follow their hobby in whatever way their resources and abilities allow. That said, there does seem to be a noticeable absence of N gauge layouts at the better-observed end of the spectrum. There have been a few exceptions, such as John Birkett-Smith's Totnes, and the erstwhile Acton Mainline, but N gauge generally seems to be stuck where the larger scales were some decades ago in terms of general modelling philosophy. Many of the models seen appear to be glorified train sets or 'theme park model railways'. There appears to be relatively few attempts to make accurate models reflecting well-observed real world practice. To some extent, the N gauge fraternity seems never to have escaped the gimmick mentality of fitting too much in a small space, rather than using that space to increase realism. I recently rejoined the N Gauge Society, fully expecting to find significantly risen standards

from 20 years ago when I was last a member. Unfortunately, I have not yet seen this.

I'm not advocating a rivet-counting-at all-expenses approach – I for one have neither the time nor inclination to abandon commercial N gauge track standards and rolling stock – but it's what you do with them that can make the difference. While models such as Chee Tor demonstrated the potential of the 2mm-ish scales, you don't need such space to achieve good results. I also have a very limited modelling space, little larger than lan Casey's, but I am using it to model just one end of a large station almost to full scale. It is still providing much reward, and the small scale is not preventing a significant level of authenticity.

I don't think it's the dearth of layouts full of card kits and ready-to-plant resin buildings that is the problem, it's those that aim higher, and especially those that achieve significant character, which can be harder with such a small scale. It's ironic that as the rolling stock available in N gauge becomes ever more realistic, the layouts on which it is running seem stuck in the modelling dark ages.

S&D signals

I thought you might be interested in seeing a typical S&D lower quadrant signal that I have made in 4mm scale. This particular design was unique to the S&D with the post being constructed of two old bullhead rails bolted together flush with London & South Western Railway or Stevens & Co. (signalling contractor) fittings. Quite a number of these signals survived into the 1960s, many being modernised with upper quadrant arms.

The Southern Railway also constructed signal posts from old bullhead rails, but these were bolted together with spacers so that there was a gap of approximately 6" between the two rails. Four rails were used for bracket signals.

As you will see the signal is motorised with a Peco point motor which operates it via a 4:3 reduction crank. The whole thing was a bit fiddly to make and I would not fancy trying it in 2mm scale! The fittings are commercially available brass etchings and white metal castings but the platform and handrails were scratch-built from brass strip and wire.

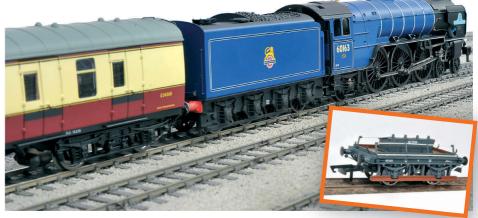

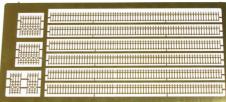

Comet's new motorgearbox combo

omet Models have attached a Swiss made coreless motor to a self-build gearbox (full instructions supplied) that uses British made crossed helical gears to produce a powerful drive train for large 4mm scale locos.

Coreless motors are well known for their low current consumption, low inertia and high power output. This motor is rated at 2 watts and when coupled to the crossed helical gears in this gearbox (which are more efficient than a worm and pinion) there is plenty of power available for the heaviest trains.

As well as being more efficient than a worm and pinion, crossed helical gears allow the gearbox to 'drive back', ie: the motor can turn the locomotive wheels or the wheels can turn the motor. This can be a useful feature in the final detailing and painting of a loco, but it also means that when a train is driven down a gradient then the weight of the train will influence the speed of the loco! Drive carefully down gradients!

Coreless motors need a smooth DC supply to

perform satisfactorily, and feedback controllers will cause the motor to buzz and possibly cause damage. If using DCC it is important to use a decoder that will allow the CVs to

be set to turn off back EMF and output only a smooth DC waveform.

The gearbox mount is etched from nickel silver and the pack includes the motor, fixing screws, all the gears, bearings and layshafts and is easy to assemble.

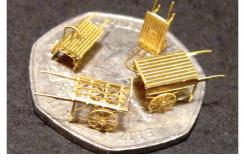

Farish N gauge Mk.2 coaches

The Mk.2 coach has been re-tooled in N gauge by Graham Farish, **Nigel Burkin** takes a look at this important new release.

onstructed in the late 1960s at Derby Works, the Mk.2A coach is an icon of the early Inter-City era, a development of the Mk.2Z incorporating different gangway doors and improved interiors with an increase in the use of aluminium fittings. Outwardly, Mk.2A coaches look the same as the first builds of Mk.2 with the same size passenger doors, windows and window arrangement, including the centre doors fitted to Tourist Second Open (TSO) coaches. The key external spotting feature are the lime green folding gangway doors which replaced the Mk.1 style sliding door fitted to the Mk.2Z stock.

Several types of coach were constructed to the Mk.2A design. The TSO stock seats 64 passengers in open saloons with 2 x 2 seating and is one of the coaches represented by the new Graham Farish models. Numbered 5257 to 5433, they were augmented with a small fleet of Brake Second Open (BSO) brake coaches which share the same body shell with Mk.2A Brake First Corridor (BFK) stock. The saloon 2 x 2 seating is correspondingly spaced wider apart to match the first class window format giving a total capacity of 31 passengers. Consequently, the guard's and van area of the coach is shortened in common with all BFK stock. Numbered 9417 to 9438, they were built in 1967 and 1968

One other coach features in this batch of retooled Mk.2 coaches and that is the First Corridor or FK. 40 coaches were built in 1968 numbered 13435 to 13475, by Derby Works once again. Accommodation is in seven compartments with three a-side seating giving a total seating capacity of 42. Two lavatories are located at either end of the coach and there is only one centre door located on the corridor side. Some of the FK coaches were declassified to standard class and renumbered in the 19452-19473 number series in the mid 1980s, with some reclassified back to first class status as operational changes dictated.

All of the Mk.2A coaches were finished in BR rail blue/grey, some with Inter-city branding and others without. They were operated on the

Eastern, Western and Midland Regions with transfers to the Scottish Region over time. The fleet remained more or less intact until the early 1990s, where they could be found working on Network South East services. Many were withdrawn and scrapped in 1991 leaving a small pool which found deployment with Regional Railways on services in the north west. By this time, they were largely painted in Regional Railways livery or a painted out version of Network South East colours. The demise of so many of early Mk.2 stock, including Mk.2As was largely attributed to the introduction of Class 156 and 158 on routes once operated by short locomotive hauled trains together with electrification of routes in East Anglia and the introduction of Class 159s on the Exeter-Waterloo route. A number of coaches of the Mk.2A design passed into preservation.

Today, a handful of the survivors that made it into use with Regional Railways still operate today. Riviera Trains is one operator of Mk.2A stock with seven TSOs; whilst West Coast Railways has two TSOs. Of the BSOs, only two remain in active main line use with DRS as support and escort vehicles. They are currently painted in DRS blue with compass logos. A model of the escort coaches is to be offered in N gauge by Graham Farish. Of the FKs, one survives with a main line operators but was last recorded as being in store with West Coast Railways.

The models themselves are completely new toolings with up-to-date features and fine moulding. Farish kindly sent over two models for review: The BSO No.E9430 (374-680) and the TSO numbered E5284 (374-710); both finished in 1970s condition BR blue/grey livery without Inter-City markings and numbered for the Eastern Region.

Bodyshell

The Mk.2A models mark a change in the way that Graham Farish produces Mk.2 stock where the original coaches were represented with clear bodyshells and over-printing. The new models feature solid moulded plastic bodies with finely moulded detail for handrails, door



the doors themselves. The shape is excellent too, with the correct tumblehome, roof dome and end profile.

The BSO is correctly modelled with a first class body shell with widely spaced passenger saloon windows. The same body could be used by Graham Farish to represent a BFK, using a different interior moulding.

The roof of both models is a separate moulding and fits very neatly to the bodyshell. Roof vents are correctly spaced and positioned and represent dome vents as used on all pressure ventilated Mk.2 coaches. Other separate mouldings include the twin folding doors fitted to the gangways and the neatly finished flush glazing which really makes these models.

Underframe, wheels and bogies

Separately moulded components make up the underframe which includes air brake detail and brake rodding. The underframe boxes are neat models in their own right and neatly assembled to the floor. A small detail worth noting on the BSO is the inclusion of the footboard fitted to one of the underframe boxes which corresponds with the guard's entry door.

Bogies are also neatly tooled with separate spring detail and a fine appearance. A slight upward bend in the top of the bogie side frame moulding could be seen when viewed along the length of the coach. Wheels are the now familiar Graham Farish fine flange metal wheelsets with insulated axles. They rotate freely in the bogies and result in a very free rolling coach. Overall, the coaches weigh around 25g and layout tests demonstrated that they would benefit from a little additional weight to further improve what is already good performance over commercially available N gauge track.

Mk.2As with close coupling cams which are neatly concealed at the coach ends. N gauge standard NEM coupling pockets are also fitted and the coaches are equipped with 'Rapido' style couplings. Close coupling cams allow operation of the coaches on sharp curves using short shank couplings and the slightest gap between the gangway faces and buffers.

Paint colours and finish

Livery colours on both sample models are neatly applied with no dust or other blemish. The roof paint appears to be a little thick and this is visible by the way it has pooled around the roof vents. Colours are accurate, lining is thin, dense and straight whilst printed detail is sharp. An eggshell finish has been applied to the models which is even and gives the model a pleasing appearance. Small details are picked out in different paint colours and the end gangway doors are the correct colour.

Overall, the models of the Mk.2A capture the appearance and character of the full-size coaches beautifully and are worthy companions to the previously retooled Mk.1 coaches. They bode well for the recently announced Mk.2e/f air conditioned coaching stock.

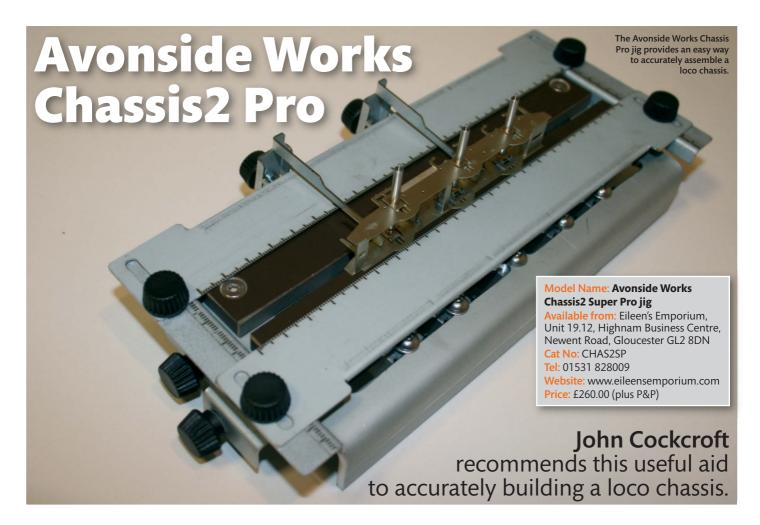

Tried&Tested

or some time I have been aware that a large number of people interested in modelling do not consider building loco kits because they are scared of the challenge. But kit building is both satisfying and can save you money (especially in O gauge) and, more importantly, add immeasurably to the pleasure and satisfaction of the hobby. It is getting the thing to run that seems to be the main obstacle, a valid anxiety because a model that runs badly is very demotivating. If you are planning to build a few locos, or get the bug after building your first, the Avonside Works Chassis2 Pro jig is something to consider seriously, because correctly used it eliminates a whole number of basic variables that can make your chassis a pit of despair! It is quite expensive - about the price of a reasonable 4mm kit or a cheaper 7mm kit - but you only need one and then you are set up for the rest of your hobby life!

Making up a loco chassis, whether scratch or kit-built, requires certain rules to be followed if running is ever to be satisfactory. The chassis

has to be square in all three dimensions, all the wheels should be on the track whether the chassis is rigid, compensated or sprung, and the coupling rod crank pin holes must be spaced exactly the same as the axle centres. Other things to do with the wheels, the electrical pickup, the motor and gears have also to be right, but essentially the chassis structure must follow the rules above or you're wasting your time! The Avonside Works Chassis2 Pro addresses all of these requirements and if used with care will result in perfect chassis structures every time.

The sample I used is for O gauge and comes with 3/16" diameter axle pins, but Avonside will replace these with 1/8" and 2mm diameter for 4mm models on request. There is a smaller version especially for 4mm models. The core of the device is a platform that contains adjustable sliders into which the axle pins are screwed so that they pass vertically through a slot in the platform. The sliders are below the platform and are moved by rotating threaded rods from the end of the jig. These are adjusted so that the

coupling rods fit over the turned down ends of the shorter spacers. The sliders are secured with bolts so that the axle pins are exactly at the same spacing as the coupling rods and exactly in line. By clamping the chassis side frames onto the platform with the bearings located by the axle pins you are assured that the bearings are at exactly the correct spacing and in line. Provision is made to assemble up to a ten coupled chassis and the device will serve equally well for bogies and tender chassis. The instructions are on a CD that includes photos, some written instructions with clear diagrams of all the component parts of the jig, and a video of the jig in use.

Getting started

The loco I built is a Midland Railway Johnson 3130 class 0-6-0 from a former Fourtrack Models kit. This kit originated in 4mm with my late friend George Norton and is, I believe, still available in that scale from London Road Models. The Fourtrack 7mm version is now

marketed by Dragon Models but Chris Basten says that the main change he has made is to revise the instructions to include photo illustrations of the principle stages in assembly.

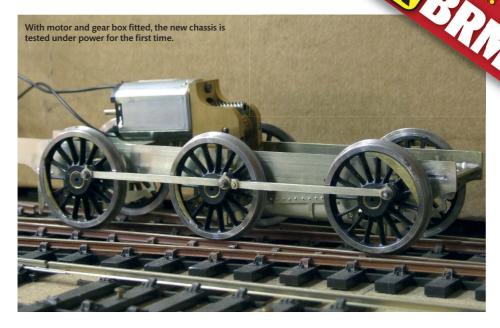
The first parts of any chassis to be built are the coupling rods because they are used to set up the jig. The chassis components are etched on quite thick nickel silver and the original coupling rod design was intended to flex around the centre crank pin and not in the link immediately behind it. I went to some trouble to alter the arrangement so that the rods flex as the prototype because I don't like the idea of play in the centre crank pin bearing resulting in changes in the overall length of the rods.

By messing about with the rods I could create another problem by accidentally making one rod a bit longer than the other. This is not a good thing, but the Avonside jig can be used to set up the rods by fitting them over the alignment pins as you work on them.

What sort of chassis?

The Avonside jig is useful for setting up a chassis whatever the suspension option you choose. The simplest option is completely rigid axles which have the advantage that the wheels only move round, not up or down and the coupling rods do not need to be jointed or flexible. This is a robust and straightforward system and has been used effectively on many models. The disadvantage can be if slow running is required and/or the track is not too level, causing electrical pick-up problems.

There are a whole range of options for



ensuring that the wheels make maximum contact with the track. They vary from giving the centre driver some movement up and down - with the other wheels rigid - to compensation where some wheels move but are controlled by pivots and beams, right up to a fully sprung chassis. Or you can make a combination of springing, rigid and compensation - the common objective of all of this is to keep the wheels on the track, mainly to ensure good electrical pick-up. The Avonside jig enables all

of these things to be done, or at least avoids some of the inaccuracies that can cause the downfall of good running. So you can choose the system that suits you, but the simpler the better in my opinion!

In the case of the Midland 3130, which is a smaller 0-6-0, I added flexibility by making the rear axle rigid, springing the middle axle and fitting a compensation beam to the front axle. This is done by allowing the bearings to move up and down, but a short fixed beam or rod is soldered along the

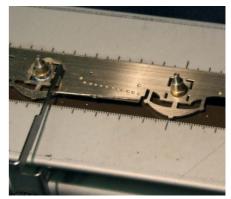

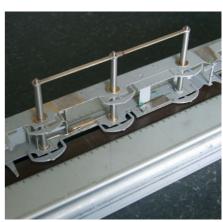

centre line of the chassis so that it touches the middle of the front axle only, taking the weight and levelling the chassis. The Avonside jig enables all this to be done easily and with confidence that the various parts are located correctly so therefore the chassis should run perfectly.

Using the rods

So now to really get started (but remember I would now use the jig to make the rods!). I had soldered the rods up and made them pivot as mentioned above, and I ensured that they slipped freely over the pins with no slop. The instructions warn you that there may be some messing about to get the alignment rods locked in an accurate position though I had no problems. Only when you can lift the rod off the pins without resistance should you go onto the next stage and on no account should you move the pins again until the chassis is set up completely. My efforts with the coupling rod holes paid off in that I got both sets of rods to fit over the pins with little resistance.

With the jig set up I could move onto locating the bearings in the frames. For the delectation of those of you who are of a more rigid disposition, I first tried out the jig with the original holes in the chassis without any option to move a bearing up or down. If you are using the jig in this way you must first make sure the pins are absolutely in line by pushing the sliding fence (the long silver bit that goes along the jig and has calibrations on it!) up to the alignment pins and make sure it touches all of them at the same time.

It may seem obvious but first ensure that the bearings fit in the holes in the chassis prior to fitting them on the jig - in other words, are the holes in the chassis big enough? If, when in the jig, they refuse to fit in the frames even though they did when you tested them, you will have to file the holes in the chassis until they fit. On no account mess about with the alignment

pins! To ensure the chassis sits level with the track, the top edge is pushed against the sliding fence, which is then screwed down. To ensure that both sides of the chassis are the same and the axles are not further forward on one side than the other, an end stop is provided to stop the chassis moving along the jig.

The chassis side is then clamped in place using some special clamps provided with the jig. I found them a bit of a fiddle to fit but they stop anything moving about. A slight problem was that the bearings sit on the base of the jig but cause the chassis sides to be lifted by about 1mm, offering the potential of the sides not being square to the bearings. However if the clamps are located in line with and close to the bearings, the chassis is forced equally onto the bearing flanges and stays level - but keep an eye out for this. When everything is secure the bearings can be soldered into place, and the other side of the chassis treated in the same way, but using the sliding fence in the other side of the jig.

Flexibility

If I was building a rigid chassis I would have soldered all the bearings and gone onto the chassis assembly stage. However, as mentioned above I was going to make the chassis operate flexibly and I had to make the middle and the front bearings move up and down. So once the rear bearing had been soldered in place I removed the frames and turned my attention to the other four bearings. Though I was going to compensate the front axle and spring the middle axle, the treatment of the bearings is exactly the same. Sliding hornguide assemblies are available commercially from a number of sources and the jig can be used with any of them. I usually simply elongate the holes in the frames at the top and bottom and secure the bearing with a length of wire soldered to the frame at one end and the top of the bearing at the other, this also acts as a light spring. Whatever the method you use the main consideration is to get the sliding fence in the right place to ensure a level chassis. Making pencil marks on the end calibration is a good way to do this rapidly once you have set it up

into the Avonside jig after first putting the bearings over the two front alignment pins. The sliding fence can be positioned by using the pencil marks on the ends of the jig. When everything is set up, solder the bearings to the wire bearing springs (or if you are using hornguides, attach them to the frame), then lift the frame out of the jig and do the same to the other side using the opposite side fence. You now have two complete side frames ready for assembly. Check that the bearings move freely up and down with a tendency to remain at the bottom of their travel. The Avonside jig makes assembling the chassis easy and I did the whole thing in about 40 minutes which is good considering I spent ages checking everything about ten times in a sort of gibbering paranoia - if something seems easy I get worried that there is a hidden snag and it really

Next I unscrewed and wiped clean the short alignment pins and replaced them with the long pins that will fit right across the chassis and locate all the bearings relative to each other. I then fitted the vertical fence. The vertical fence is a long 'L'-section strip that sits on top of the side fences and is fixed by the same bolts. By lining its vertical face with the edge of the side fence the top of both sides of the chassis are lined up with each other so that they are exactly parallel.

I used the long pins and the vertical fence to locate both sides of the chassis onto their spacers. Make sure that the tab and slots for the frame spacers engage fully into each other and that the spacers are in contact with the frames at all points. Check that the frames are parallel in a vertical direction - and you can solder the spacers in place to both sides of the chassis job done. It is all so easy it feels like cheating!

A moving experience

Theoretically the job of the Avonside jig was now over but I left it set up for this chassis while I went to the next and most important stage - getting the thing to run. After all, if in a panic stricken moment I had upset the chassis while messing about with it, all I had to do was pop it back in the jig and refix the offending component - I was getting soft!

When I try to get a chassis to run I proceed in a logical and systematic way that is aimed at identifying any problems as they arise rather than being presented with a complex series of potential problems in a badly running finished chassis! So I first tried the wheels in the bearings, I have a 3/16" tapered reamer that is superb for opening out axle bearings - the only thing you have to watch out for is that it can jam in the hole and bend the suspension wires out of line - which is why I left the Avonside jig set up to check I hadn't moved the spacing. Once I had got the wheels to rotate freely I fitted the rods. Here I found - and often find that there is some binding and resistance at some point in the rotation of the wheels. So I then open out the crank pin holes in the rods a little and see if it corrects the stiffness. With a bit of easing of the outer holes I got the chassis to roll evenly when pushed. Finally I fitted the motor. Using crocodile clips on short leads I connected the motor to a controller and it moved really smoothly under its own power. I think the Avonside jig was vindicated!

I must say that the Avonside jig delivers what it says on the can. It is a luxury item but as with all good tools it removes to some extent the scrabbling, perspiration soaked, gibbering, fumbling that I often find is my reality when things seem to go wrong. Such bad hair days are bound to happen, but because it is a hobby you can just go off and watch TV, drink your favourite drink and come back another day. However, another cause of these wretched days is poor or inadequate tools, and though you don't need an Avonside jig to build a chassis that runs there is a sort of easy professionalism about using such a sophisticated and accurate tool.

So if you have got the loco kit bug and have the will power to divert some of your scarce resources from buying another loco kit, seriously consider investing in an Avonside Works Chassis2 Pro chassis jig. I don't think you will regret it!

Tried&Tested

Modelling products put through their paces by the BRM staff...



K, so what is it and why would I want one? Well, we railway modellers invariably have tucked away somewhere in a room, or a separate room in itself some form of a workbench, where, we keep tools, brushes, paints and so forth, quite often in an untidy state.

As a solution to keeping your pots of paint, thinners and brushes tidy and organised, Hobbybase have manufactured this workstation which they retail via their website for £24.99.

Upon opening the sample that we were sent in a sturdy cardboard box, you are faced with a smell of new flat pack furniture similar to that of a well-known Swedish manufacturer, as indeed, this paint base is essentially flat pack itself, only on a smaller scale, still requiring self-assembly.

The sides and rear part of the paint base are 8mm thick, with corners mitred at 45° angles for a flush fit. Other structural parts are manufactured from 3mm thick MDF with a laminated white PVC surface. An A5 double-sided cutting mat is also included.

All that is required from the end user before use is a minimum amount of assembly, but this was no problem, as the pre-grooved slots help to locate the parts together, ensuring a snug fit.

No trimming of parts was necessary and only a minimum amount of wood glue was used (not included). No screws or nails are used during assembly, which couldn't really be any easier, just a few minutes in total were needed, and, allowing for drying time, you are left with a sturdy tray.

When assembled, as can be seen from the photos, the paint base is on three layers, the first holding the double-sided cutting mat in place which has a cm guide grid to ease cutting. This is, however, only intended as a rough guide and I wouldn't recommend it as a replacement for an accurate steel rule; the printed lines are a little on the thick side. The second layer has a centre cut out in an arc shape, measuring 36mm in width which can hold twelve 14mL sized tins of paint. The paint tin storage of this miniature bench is further extended by the upper-most level, which in addition to being able to carry a further eight tins, can also hold in its two 54mm diameter holes, say a bottle of thinners or a small can of spray paint. The twelve 10mm dia. holes in this layer can store your brushes, pencils and pens, lining pens, or at a push, even a slim airbrush. For things that don't quite fit into these holes, other slots and smaller holes in varying sizes are also

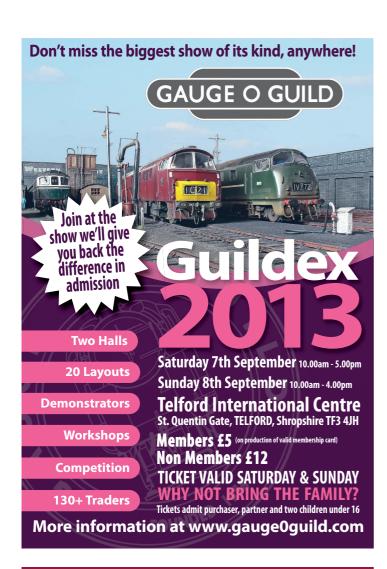
allocated to tools such as scalpels and tweezers.

So, what is the overall verdict then? I suspect that this is a workbench aimed more at the OO and N gauge modellers due to the limited workspace of the cutting mat; it would be difficult to model anything in a larger scale on a 221 x 151mm cutting mat, although you may get away with an O gauge wagon kit at a pinch.

I like the idea of the workbench being able to store a large number of paints, as quite often these modelling projects do tend to involve more than a handful of colours, especially when weathering is concerned.

In my opinion, it is therefore ideally suited to modellers who intend to build the odd plastic kit; where part cutting, a minimum amount of filing, gluing and painting of models is required, whether this be model trains, aircraft or other, for which it is ideally suited. It allows you to put everything away after a session and even has cut-out handles on the side to facilitate carrying.

However, for those of you that model larger scales and require a little more workspace or are seeking a durable workbench allowing soldering and such like to take place, this workbench might not tick all the boxes.
