Scenic tools & materials



A milk train rolls in from Highbridge, having called at the United Dairies plant at Bason Bridge. The engine is one of the rebuilt Bulldogs. Although goods engines were by now in plain black, the first rebuilds appeared in lined blue. The leading van is built from a trial etch commissioned by one of our group members.

Many layout owners have tales to tell but Edington Junction is very much the story of a group project, explains Club Secretary David Grimwood.

o you have a layout?" Not a question I was expecting during my first effort at demonstrating 0 Gauge at a model railway show in 2014. I had taken along some Somerset & Dorset stock to work on, and this attracted the question. I realised at least two exhibition managers were looking for 'blue period' S&D layouts for 2016; the 50th anniversary of the S&D's closure. So I rashly answered "Yes", hoping my local group (the East Kent 0 Gauge Group – EK0GG for short) could be persuaded to come up with something.

Although the group had collected several layouts, and some members had experience of exhibitions, we were keen to build a new exhibition layout from scratch, but what? Based on ideas shared by members, I came up with Edington Junction, as it included the elements we wanted. Although not in Kent, the station had been in the care of the LSWR

then the Southern, so could be worked as a Southern layout, since many members model the Southern or BR(S).

## **Layout Design**

Opting for a real location saves a lot of discussion. We stuck to the prototype, which included a station with three platforms, a branch line and some sidings. We had to reduce the length of the scenic section to fit into our club room, which sadly meant losing a level crossing and squeezing in a crossover by the platforms.

A chance phone call with an offer of six ready-made 5ft by 2ft 6in boards saved us much time. A trip to a beekeeper's wooded enclosure at a nearby wildlife park (where else?) and they were ours – flimsier than we had hoped, but with a little strengthening they have given fault-free service, and saved us a lot of time. Our in-house carpenter built

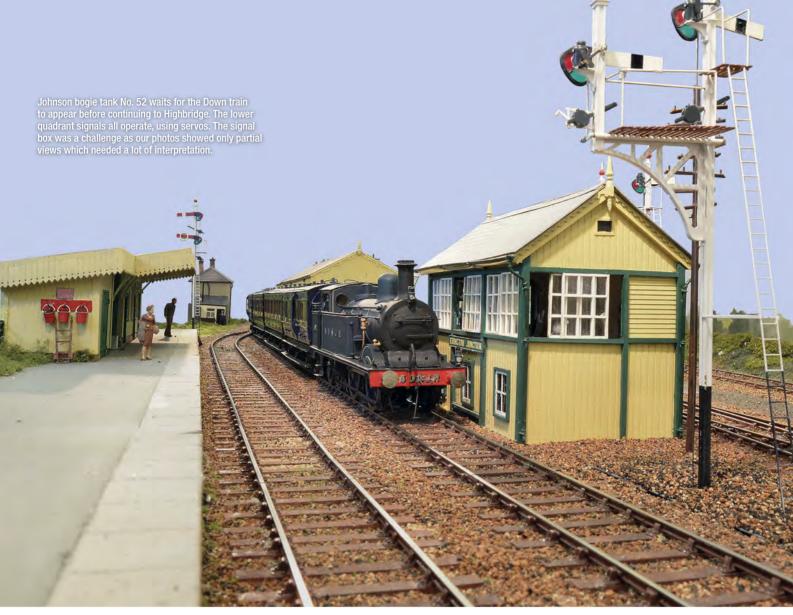

the trestles, and off we went.

The group was determined to do the best job we could, so we went for hand-built track, using C&L components and wooden sleepers – a completely new experience for nearly everyone. We opted for 1.5mm sawn ply sleepers, to reduce the amount of ballast needed and therefore the weight. Feeding thousands of chairs on to rail requires patience and myopic eyesight, and despite our best efforts, numerous rails were fitted with chairs upside down or the wrong way round. We thought we had fixed all of these, but there is nothing like running a variety of engines and stock to pinpoint the ones we had missed!

The pointwork provided different challenges, particularly fitting the operating rods to the Fulgurex motors underneath the boards (using ideas from Norman Solomon). However, we feel the end result is well worth the effort, especially the sweeping curves, and was actually easier to build than fiddling with ready-made track. The point motors switch the polarity, and despite misgivings from our in-house electrician, we have had only one failure so far.



# K Y DETAILS

Edington made its first public appearance 15 months after work began, running a variety of members' stock. But the S&D anniversary was looming, and as the only S&D modeller in the group, the gauntlet was thrown down. I have never built with exhibiting in mind, and also needed to produce much more stock against tight deadlines. Fortunately, I had already managed to collect a variety of S&DJR kits.

The stock used includes.

2x Fox Walker saddle tanks (Mercian) 2x Johnson 0-4-4T bogie tanks - the mainstay of passenger services (Mercian and JM) An original 0-6-0 Bulldog (Gibson) 2x rebuilt Bulldogs or 3Fs (JM and JLTRT) Bachman 4F 0-6-0.

I rebuilt the tender as a Johnson version, and then attempted fitting a smoke unit in the engine,



whereupon the whole thing fell into a heap of bits. So much for 'ready-to-run'!

Other locomotives ready for service include a No.27A, a 2-4-0 rebuilt by the S&D specifically to work the branch, and also a '783' class 4-4-0 and a 'Dazzler' 0-4-0T, neither of which actually ran through Edington. We are often asked about the S&D 7F 2-8-0, although they were too heavy to run trains through Edington. Nonetheless, one will appear soon.

Coaches are a mixture of 4-wheelers based on S&D drawings using Slaters kits; six-wheelers from Connoisseur, Blacksmith and Slaters; and Blacksmith bogie coaches. Wagons are from ABS, Slaters and Parkside plus some S&D items from Furness and Powsides. The stock is mostly fitted with the Dingham coupling system, which transforms shunting at exhibitions, once the operators learn to trust it!

The layout is stored in a lean-to attached to the hall where we meet, and is prone to extreme changes in heat and humidity. Track joints have suffered, and we have since wired each piece of rail to the power source, rather than relying on connections across track joints. We also had problems with sections shorting out, until we realised that the switch rails on the points can move with temperature changes. These were quickly corrected with a pair of pliers during a show and later by filling the isolation gap with a sliver of filler or plastic.

## **Buildings and Scenery**

There are not many photos predating 1954, when the branch and signal box was dismantled, but help from our group's architect and other S&D modellers enabled us to include all of the buildings, built to scale. Different members volunteered to scratch-build them, which was a new experience for nearly everyone, and we are pleased with the consistency and detail of the result. The track layout was completed before we had finished our research of the buildings, which has led to some very tight clearances as the signal box was larger than we had realised, so we have had to omit the point rodding.

The superb working signals were also a 'first' for the builder. We initially had some fun with signals flapping randomly up and down, which was finally cured by fitting suppressors in the engines, and shortening and insulating the wiring to the servos.

After watching the DVD by Barry

# **LAYOUT FOCUS**

Norman on scenery, we followed slavishly his methods and guidance, even down to using 'Doncaster Green' for the grass. We invited a tree modeller from a local military modelling group to one of our meetings to demonstrate his methods, and were thrilled when he donated some of his own work to the layout, including a fallen tree which attracts attention at exhibitions.

The track was glued down and painted, before the cork ballast of varying hues was spread and glued (but not painted), and the cess added. The choice of warm lighting complements the colours of the scenery, giving a pleasing sunny appearance.

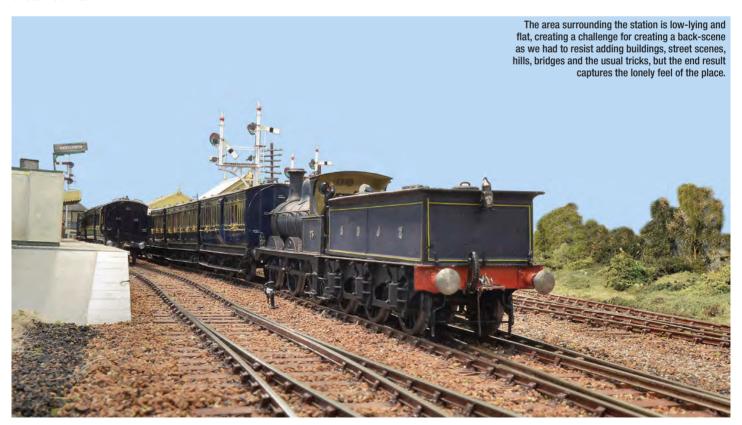
## Operation

Initially, I drew up an operating plan based on the 1924 timetables. We were constrained by the capacity of the fiddle yards, particularly the one that had to cope with the branch trains. Following the actual timetable proved too complicated to operate at an exhibition, so a simpler routine was adopted.

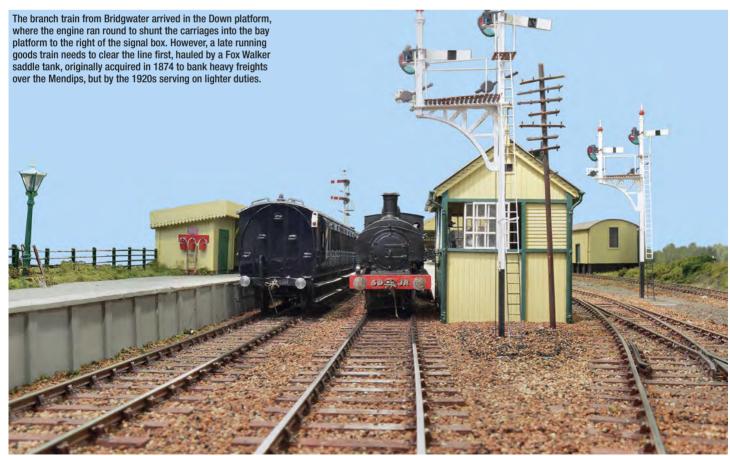
We have kept one delightful prototypical procedure though. The branch train arrived and crossed into the Down platform. With the shunt signal off, the engine ran round the train, shunting the carriages into the bay platform. Passenger trains in each direction then arrive to cross in the station. It must have been a bizarre sight to have three trains in this remote wayside station at the same time!

A Johnson bogie tank turns on to the branch line to Bridgwater, with the unique Somerset & Dorset headcode indicating it to be a passenger working. The stock is fitted with Dingham couplings to facilitate automatic coupling and uncoupling,



Once the through trains had left, the branch train would return to Bridgwater. However it is great fun to be able to set the branch and Up trains off together, replicating the races that drivers indulged in on the real thing. The whole routine always seems to surprise and entertain onlookers.

To allow the fiddle yard operators to sort out the next round of passenger trains, a single goods train will arrive and be shunted, which can be quite convoluted because of the track layout. On occasion, whoever is operating is tempted to vary the pattern (usually when I have gone off for a coffee), and within minutes the whole layout is in gridlock!





We wanted to have a large sector plate at each end, long enough to hold complete trains, plus a small sector plate for dealing with the engines. The idea is that a train arrives, the engine detached and run on to the small sector plate, which allows it to run back along a vacant track to a storage siding. The tracks are aligned and powered by small sliding bolts.

However, we have found two major problems with the system. Firstly, the fiddle yards have turned out to be very heavy. There are a limited number of group members able to heave them in and out of the van, or to stack them in our club store. Secondly, the bolt system has proved fiddly to work, the bolts being small and stiff. We also sometimes forget to check they are all unbolted before swinging the sector plate, which does not do the trackwork a lot of good.

We now have plans to replace both fiddle yards with traversers with the aim of easing and simplifying operation, as well as saving on finger nails. Reducing the overall weight remains a challenge while maintaining the robust structure needed for transporting to and from exhibitions.

## And finally

So yes, we do now have a layout! Our members responded to the original challenge with enthusiasm, throwing themselves into completely new (to them) tasks of tracklaying, signal building, scenic work and even exhibiting. This enabled the layout to be finished in time for the S&D anniversary year, during which it was shown at five exhibitions, including one in Edington village itself. With more shows already booked, we are keen to put it to good use and we welcome invitations.

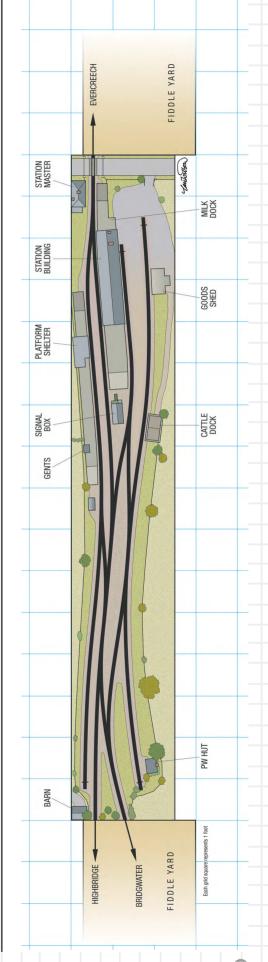

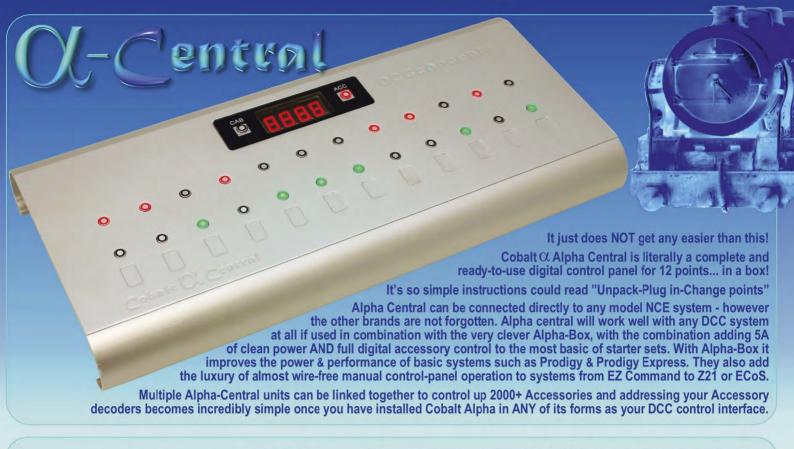

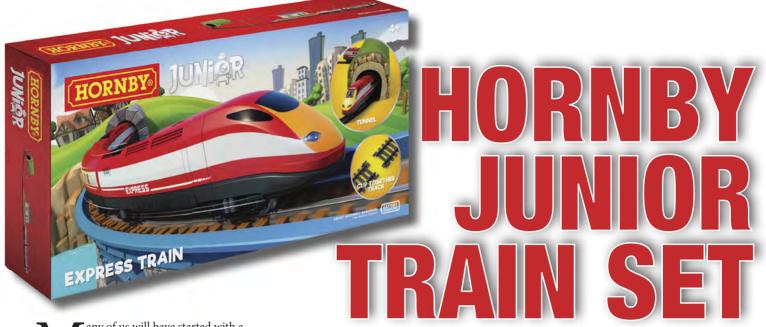

any of us will have started with a basic set from Hornby, and this set is aimed squarely at the toy market. Indeed, with its plastic track, batterypowered loco, cardboard buildings and box art emphasising play value, this is unashamedly a toy. As such, Hornby aims to sell these to outlets that wouldn't usually be interested in a traditional set. With luck, by the time you read this, piles will be found in supermarkets and garden centres placing the brand name in front of people who might not know it, or at least haven't thought about it for years.

In the box there is a circuit of clip-together plastic track that looks quite a lot like the stuff we use on "real" model railways. The train is a three-car Voyager lookalike painted in an Express livery. More recognisable liveries will be offered in the future, but it was initially important that the Hornby brand was prominent on the box.

Scenery is also included, with a cardboard station that clips together without the need for glue, and a tunnel built the same way. Also there are a couple of plastic trees, four catenary masts and a pair of signals that give away the Italian origins of this set. Assembly is straightforward - make up the tunnel, clip the track together and feed it through this and add the other scenic items. A cross-headed screwdriver opens a box for two AA batteries. Just put the train on the track, simple hook and loop couplings join the carriages, press the left hand button on the top and off it goes. I wonder how much play value the set really offers, though.

You might consider that there are plenty of really cheap toy train sets around that offer the same entertainment but Hornby has a trick up its sleeve - youngsters can run their train on a normal OO layout. Visit granddad and you can take your own train.

This is a really good idea. To test it out I took the train to my local club to give it a run

Two years after its announcement, the first of the Hornby Junior range of train sets has finally launched. But will it run on Grandad's 00 Gauge track? Phil Parker finds out...

on some scale OO layouts. Initial impressions were good. The power car bumped a bit on complex pointwork but generally behaved itself. Sadly, adding the coaches was a bit of a disaster. These have no real weight and, as soon as they encountered anything other than plain track, they leapt off the rails.

Closer inspection of the wheels shows that the unpowered ones are very coarse and the distance between the backs is 13.6mm. That's 1mm narrower than Hornby's own metal wheels. It might not seem a lot, but on finer tracks it's enough to derail the featherweight vehicles. Some Code 100 is a little more tolerant in this respect, so all may be OK there. I'd suggest that the first run is watched closely.

Overall, this is a fun toy, but unless the range increases to rival Marklin 'MyWorld' the entertainment seems somewhat limited. That said, it's a brave move from our most traditional manufacturer, which will place the Hornby name on a few more Christmas lists. Expect discounting when these sets appear in mainstream stores this festive season.

## The German Alternative

An obvious competitor to the Hornby set is the Marklin MyWorld ICE Battery-Powered Sound Starter Set. This contains a sturdy plastic track, a five-car battery-powered HO size ICE train and a remote control.

The train is well built and perfectly capable of withstanding rough play. Four wheeled vehicles are easy to place on the track and each has a reasonable amount of weight. Coupling is with magnets and it's controlled via an infra-red handset. Forward and backward, different speeds and even sounds are operated from this. Best of all, this is part of a full range including buildings, operating accessories, more rolling stock and a wide selection of track.

The only downside is the price – £59.95. Is there £20 more play value? That's for buyers to decide, but having seen children trying this system out, it might well be that the German set has the edge at the moment.

Thanks to Green Scene for the loan of this set.



## Running on finescale track

Disappointed that the set didn't like the Code 75 trackwork, I set out to see if changing the wheels was possible. The powered wheels didn't seem to be a problem, just the unpowered axles. Initially I thought I could just unclip the plastic axles and replace them with metal ones. Sadly, the axles are very long - coming to the faces of the open axleboxes. Standard metal wheels just slopped around and fell out.

Opening out the axle holes with a 2mm drill bit allowed a set of Gibson top-hat brass bearings to slot in. Now the replacement wheelsets fit fine. The only problem is that the model is fitted with 10.5mm diameter wheels so you'll need to find a supplier of Romford wheels to match them. That's going to cost around £40 to convert the entire set. And while you are at it, you might add some weight to the unpowered vehicles.



# Power bogie

The drive system is ingenious. Hidden behind the bogie sideframes is a single, nonswivelling powered wheelset. Traction tyres ensure plenty of speed.



Nearest - A Junior Set wheelset. Behind -Standard Hornby metal wheels. This shows the difference in profiles. The metal wheels are a couple of millimetres larger than the plastic ones, so aren't a direct replacement.



#### **Accessories**

Four "Power poles", two trees and two signals are included with the set.

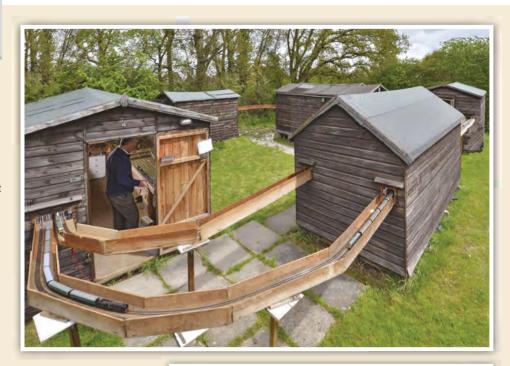

# SIX SHEDS LONG!

Rusper Model Railway Club operates a OO gauge analogue model railway based on British Railways practice between 1948 and 1964. Our railway travels through six garden sheds on an allotment site in south London. Each shed has a layout with tracks and removable panels at the end of each shed. The tracks are connected with portable external sections, which are packed away in each shed with their supporting legs. Our operating meetings are monthly on a Sunday, in all weathers – the external sections have covers to protect from rain, snow and leaves on the line. The club owns 80-odd steam and diesel locomotives and DMU units. and at the meetings we operate the railway to a timetable based on real time. There are ten stations, seven of which have goods yards, and trains are signalled between stations using bell codes based on BR practice. The timetables are quite intensive with trains every two or three minutes. It keeps us 'on the ball', although operating gets easier as members stay at one station for several sessions and become familiar with the bell codes and track layout. There are 12 rostered passenger trains including Pullmans, fast and local services and six set goods trains.



In addition, at the start of each operating session, coloured pins are used for pick-up goods wagons, which must be shunted as necessary between other services. Visitors and new members are welcome.

#### **BLOWN AWAY**

Richard appears keen on the diorama style of layout of which I'm also an advocate. N gauge is often regarded as less relevant to create convincing model scenes, but 'Staly Vegas' puts that assumption in its rightful place!

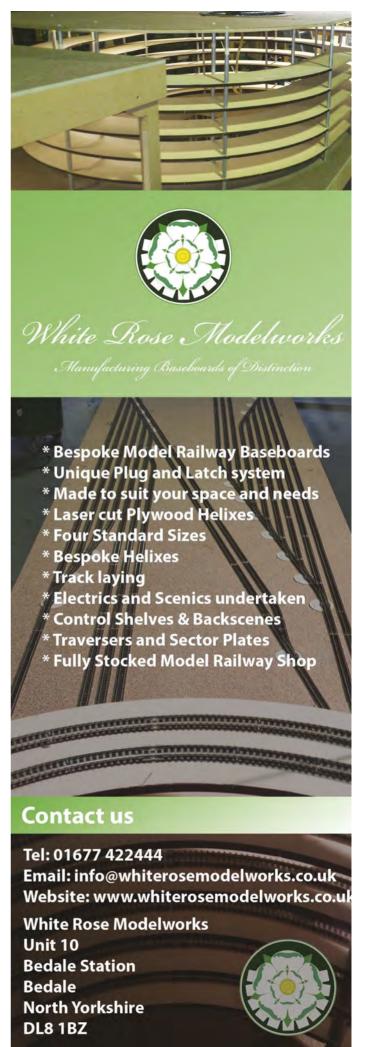

# **INSTALLING POINT** RODDING FROM A SIGNAL BOX

Kevin Phare looked at the branch line on his 'Little Muddle' layout and wondered how easy it would be to install point rodding retrospectively. Well, let's find out...

nce a thought enters my brain box it bounces around and starts to formulate into a plan. Then it seems to gather its own momentum, regardless of what I'm thinking my next move will be.

After checking through the odds and ends boxes, I realised that I had more than enough of both Wills sets - SS89 Point Rodding Kit and SS90 Point Rodding Kit to fit out the station area. Once it was clear that no extra materials would be needed, the next course of action was to start planning...

many modellers will ballast and then fit the point rodding on top. I think this is incorrect, as you can't get the rods level or straight

# **Point Rodding Preparation**

have a clear idea of what you're doing before diving in. A little thought now can save a lot of problems later on.

The other consideration is how the point rodding would have been installed in real life. For instance, I model GWR, which had a clear design ethos and manuals detailing their ways of working. I'm the first to admit that I've taken a few liberties here, but I hope the end result looks realistic.

As an example of a suggested process, the previous rodding installation at Encombe Town was different, so I took a photograph of the area in question and sketched various options until I arrived at one that looked on Little Muddle, so I decided that the three

points in the goods yard would remain under manual operation of the Yard Master and the remainder would be controlled by a signalman in a platform-sited signal box. I installed a Facing Point Lock (FPL) on the leading point into the station. I'm not sure if this would have been done here, as it was normally used on main lines where trains were moving at in excess of 30 mph.

I also searched online for a small platformmounted signal box and found some plans on a railway forum. I have no idea where this box was sited, but it met my requirements so I worked out a scale plan and set it out on the platform for an overview.

With the planning done and clear idea in my mind of how to proceed it just left the easy bit transferring and installing it on the layout.

The hole was trimmed and painted black to put everything under the platform in shadow. The edges were lined to look like wood and a MRS Victorian brick lintel fitted over the top to make it look prototypical. Unfortunately I forgot to take a picture of this stage, as I just went straight onto the next one, but you can see the end result in a later picture. Now we start the point rodding itself.



I construct as much as I can off the layout, as you can work so much easier and quicker on the work bench. I always use liquid poly glue in this type of work because it flows into all the cracks and crevices. I have cut the rods off the sprues, trimmed any excess and started to assemble the double run. Real point rodding is generally level and straight for efficient operation, so this would be my main aim here.

#### Construction

Many modellers will ballast and then fit the point rodding on top. I think this is incorrect, as you can't get the rods level or straight. Here is my recommended way of fitting point rodding either before ballasting or retrospectively.



A slip of paper marks where I need to cut the platform front for the rods to go underneath to the signal box.



The ballast was scraped away back down to the cork underlay, any sections of walkways and platform edges removed and the areas cleaned up and levelled to give a clear run for the rodding. With the clearance work done the next stage is making the rod access hole through the platform front. This was marked out and holes drilled through to allow cutting and shaping with a sharp knife.



When gluing rodding together to form banks I used my long nose pliers to line the rollers up so they could set in line correctly.

#### **PRACTICAL BRM**



I have seen other modellers do this, so I can't lay claim to it being my idea, but to assist in strengthening and lining up the rods I use thin strips of plastic fixed to the underside of each rod joint.



This technique enables relatively long runs to be constructed in line, but handle with care as they are not very strong.



Under each roller base I also fitted a spacer to ensure that they sat in the ballast and not under it. It's easier to add more ballast than it is to take it away.



The FPL linking being built and ready for installation. The control arm is fitted in situ, as it needs to go under the track. Also note the plastic base under the off track adjustment link. I have noticed on numerous real installations that metal or wood bases were used to support fittings in the ballast.



This is a typical set of rods and linkages, but I've painted them in a base coat ready for installation.



This picture shows the FPL and control rod in place with the second linkage moving the switch blade itself so for these types of installations the point is actually controlled by two levers.



Progress on sections of rodding being fitted to the track. The items in the field have been moved out of the way so that I don't knock or damage them.

The rodding is fixed alongside the track and I used drop down rods to get under the permanent way walkway. To achieve equal distance between the rods and the track, which I mentioned was high on my list of priorities, I used a 'tick strip'. This is a piece of card with the distance mark on an edge in pencil, which can be held between the track and the rods to ensure the same distance along its length. This is, and will always be, the most accurate way to transfer a measurement that needs to be repeated.



Pictures showing rodding to leading station point, all fitted level and parallel with the track.









This series of pictures build on the above, and show various areas of the rodding being fitted. The final picture shows the completed platform front, which I forgot to include earlier!

## **Ballasting**

With all the point rodding fitted and painted, ballasting could commence.

No matter which article you read, exhibition you go to, or fellow modeller you speak to, ballasting has a reputation of being a repetitive process that we must overcome.

I still use the old fashioned way of laying the ballast dry, then spray it with a fine mist – I have an excellent spray bottle given to me by my granddaughter from her Princess bead play kit - then with a syringe filled with 50/50 PVA water mix with a dash of washing up liquid added. I apply over the new ballast and leave it to set before hoovering up any excess.











# **Painting**

I thought I would keep the painting as a separate issue, as I will not rely on just a single coat of paint to finish. Too many good models are spoilt by not going that extra mile to add the bit that is most noticeable - the painting and weathering.

To achieve the results shown here is not as much effort as you might think. First, I painted everything in Lifecolor 'Roof Dirt'. Strange, you may say, but after much experiment I found it gave a dark, dirty and used look with little effort. Between the rollers I painted a wash of Vallejo medium grey paint - I varied the number of applications to give an uneven finish along the length. Then, Lifecolor weathered black was dry-brushed on and around the rollers and finished with a Vallejo oil and grease applied sparingly to the rollers, linkages, connectors and drop arms.

The result leaves the feel of a well-used set of rodding. I am very happy that I decided to fit the rodding, as it seems to make sense on the station layout and its operation. I know this won't be everyone's cup of tea; it is fiddly and there will be times when you'll feel like taking up knitting. However, when it's finished it improves the layout and makes it look prototypical.

# **ASHBOURNE** (MIDLAND)

It's not very often that a layout is built twice by the same person, but Nick Palette missed his little layout so much that he constructed it all over again.





first built Ashbourne (Midland) back in 2009/10 and got it to a reasonable state of completion, but then something else came along and hijacked my interest, so I sold it to help finance a new project - 'Tremore' (see RMWeb layout challenge 2010). Time moves on and Tremore spent five years on the exhibition circuit, and it has since been sold.

I had always liked the way I had devised Ashbourne, though, and often wondered why I had sold it. I had a hankering for another small layout after wrestling with American O scale, so I revisited the idea. However, this time I built it in a mirror image of the original.

#### **Background**

The town of Ashbourne in Derbyshire was served by the LNWR from the north and the North Staffs from the south west, the two companies meeting in Ashbourne station.

Given the town's proximity to Derby, just over 13 miles away, it has always surprised me that the Midland didn't build a branch line between them. There are two possible routes judging by the map - a pretty direct route via Mackworth and Brailsford, or a longer route from east from the Duffield to Wirksworth branch. My layout assumes the former direct route. I also assumed that the branch survived into BR days and even saw the transition from steam to diesel, but was closed in the mid-1960s by the good doctor!

#### The Layout

The whole layout, including the off-stage sector plate, is a little over 6ft long. I say a little, as the main structure is 6ft long but the removable sector plate hangs over the end by a couple of inches. This is very convenient for exhibitions, since the layout is largely in one piece and is therefore easy to transport and set up.

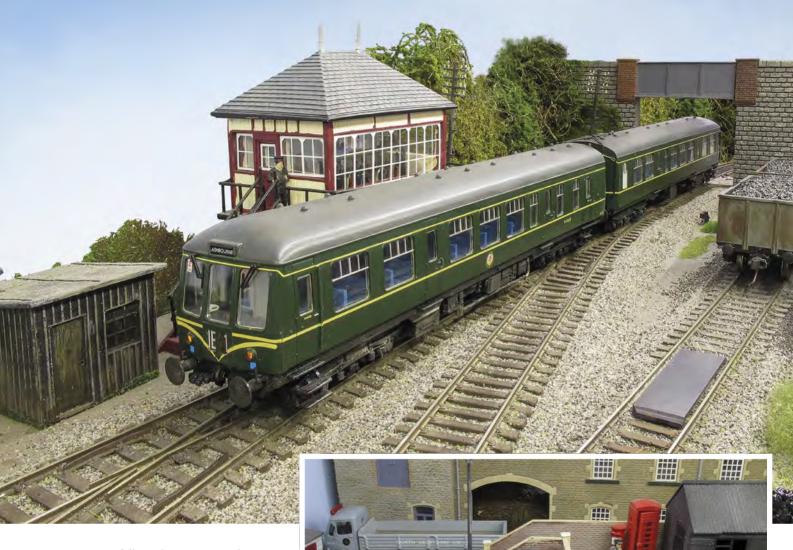

The local passenger train from Derby arriving at Ashbourne. On this occasion, it is formed of a Derby 2-car DMU (later class 108) in BR green livery with 'whickers'



Construction follows the conventional techniques, with a timber and plywood baseboard and cork tiles as track underlay. Peco code 75 track and points are used and the points are operated by piano wires under the baseboard. These reach across the width of the layout (all 1ft of it!), so it can be operated from either the front or back.

Originally, the wires would bear on micro switches to change the frog polarity, but I have recently fitted a Tam Valley frog juicer to handle this task. The layout comprises a typical small terminus station with a main platform, run round loop and a couple of sidings. It is fed from a three track sector table that pivots at the centre on a 5mm bolt. I have tried most forms of fiddle yard/storage with varying degrees of success, so I am pleased to say that this has worked reasonably well over time. However, it does suffer from temperature and humidity changes at shows.

The layout took about six months to build to a pretty complete state. I have been fortunate in having been able to arrange my own working time, which has allowed me more time to work on modelling projects.

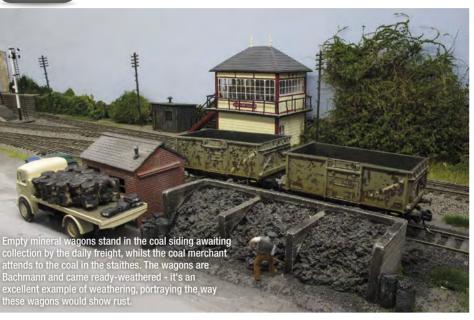
#### Operation

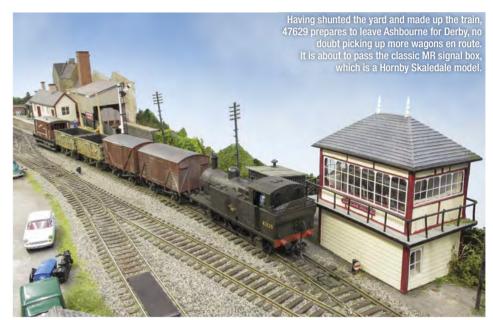
I like to replicate the prototype in the operation of my layouts. Let's consider Ashbourne for the period in which it is set. During the early 1960s car ownership was on the rise and the future of rural branch lines was uncertain. At this time, there would probably have been an hourly, or maybe two hourly service to and from Derby, with variations at the weekend. There would have been one daily freight that would have worked the sidings at stations up and down the branch. At an exhibition, that suggests that the DMU comes in and out each hour or so, and the freight arrives once and shunts before returning. I don't think that would satisfy many visitors to a show, especially if they are watching the layout between trains!

In order to keep exhibition visitors happy I need to stretch reality a little. Therefore, I use a two car Class 108 DMU and a Jinty with two coaches for passenger service, plus another Jinty and a selection of wagons for freight service, and I run a sequence of three trains. This takes about 35 minutes to complete and then repeats. Judging by observations at shows, it is unusual for people to stay in front of a layout for longer than about 15 - 20 minutes, although they will often come back again.

On the subject of freight service, my recollection from the time is that the typical branch freight train of the period was quite plain, mainly being made up of coal wagons. Other freight was carried in vans, some pre-nationalisation types, but most likely the BR standard plank or plywood types. Other types of freight would have been dealt with in the appropriate wagon as and when required, which is what I portray on the layout. It is tempting to introduce lots of variety with different types of wagon, but the railway was pretty mundane back then, with lots of the same wagons. A prototypical freight would be 15 mineral wagons and a brake van, not one of every type of wagon in the catalogue.

As far as Ashbourne is concerned the freight normally consists of two vans, two coal wagons and a brake van. Not much, you might think, but it can still take 20-25 minutes of shunting to complete delivery and collection to and from the correct sidings.

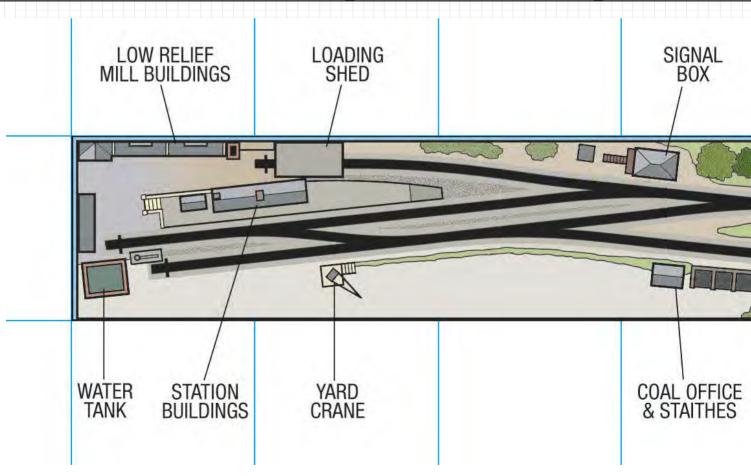
#### Couplings

Kadee couplings are standard on my layouts. For me it started over 30 years ago when I first fitted some Kadee number 5 couplings to an American box car, and they have been with me ever since. A common question I get is regarding the ease of fitting them. Now that Kadee have a number of NEM-type couplings of various lengths (Nos. 17, 18, 19 and 20) in their range, it is just a simple matter of replacing the existing coupler. However, it is important to bear in mind that the coupler height is quite critical, so investment in a Kadee height gauge (No. 205) is worth it.

It wasn't always plain sailing, as many of my wagons are early models and had coupler boxes that were too high. A solution was to use the US No. 5 and its coupler box, and either glue or screw them directly to the wagon floor.

Uncoupling can be as simple as twiddling a bamboo skewer between the couplings, or to use of one of a series of magnets either between the rails or under the track. I use a combination of both. The advantage of the magnets is that it is hands-free, but the disadvantage is that you are limited as to where you can uncouple. The advantage of the hand tool is that you can uncouple anywhere, although there is the risk of accidentally derailing the stock.

#### **Appearance**

Having mentioned the mundane appearance of trains in the period, the variety comes in the appearance of those mundane wagons. Each wagon, whilst of the same type, would appear different due to the weathering. Their appearance would range from the almost new (it didn't take long for something to weather once it had been released from overhaul/repaint), to downright shabby.

Again, I feel that a degree of weathering is important - the railway was (and still is) a dirty place. This adds to the realism and the variety when using a limited number of vehicles.

I feel weathering is an important aspect as far as the rest of the layout is concerned too. Look at the track the next time you stand on a station platform. The rails are dirty – not rusty - although rust is more likely on littleused tracks and sidings. The ballast isn't very uniform in colour, but tends to blend once weathered. Look at buildings - weathering in the form of streaks where water has run down a wall, moss growing on a roof, etc. Roads are not wholly grey, with patches from works and resurfacing, cracks where the tarmac has split, etc. Grass is not a uniform green; apart from a prize lawn or bowling green. Unfortunately, there is a tendency to make trees too small. This might be partly due to what's available off the shelf.

A fully-grown oak tree can reach 80 feet that's around 12ins in 4mm scale.

Having said that, I don't have any particularly tall trees on this layout, as I felt they would overcrowd it, but the ones that are there are probably taller than your average ready to run item. However, I like to think I have encompassed the other aspects in regard to the appearance of this layout. ■

## Meet the Modeller

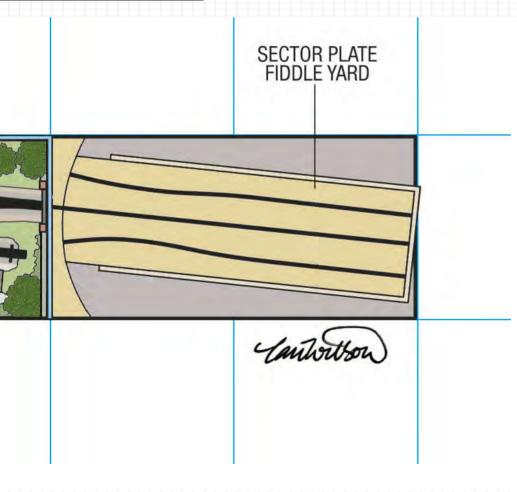

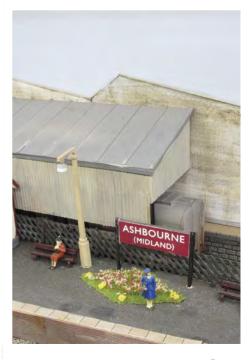
on RMWeb. Current layouts being exhibited include: Astley - BR(WR), Heath Green BR(SR) and Neuburg (East German DR).

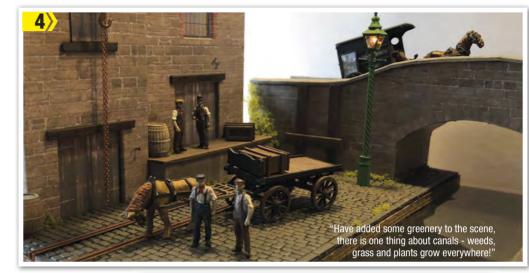

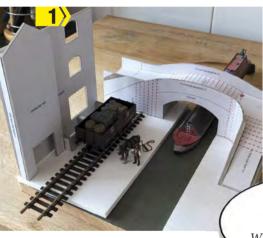

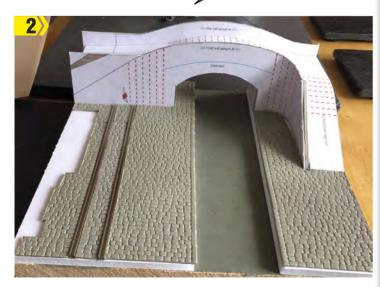

# STAMFORD EAST



Great layouts don't need to grow old, even if their builders eventually do. Robin Fox talks about owning, exhibiting and updating the late Trevor Webster's detailed model of this aristocratic branch line.

elcome to 'Stamford East', an N Gauge layout built by Trevor Webster. Trevor was a cabinet maker by trade, eventually becoming County Agent for Nottinghamshire and leaving there to take up a similar position with Grand Metropolitan Hotels. In his younger days he represented England at rowing. In addition to his railway models Trevor also made a

number of very high quality dolls houses, at least one of which is now in Hollywood, USA. Trevor's expertise was in model buildings, winning a number of N Gauge Society trophies over the years. His other layouts include 'Parnhams Maltings' (winner of the N Gauge Society best small layout trophy) 'Parnhams' and 'Whatton Parva'. Trevor sadly passed away in February 2017 at the age of 81.

I first met Trevor at Wigan show in 2013, where he was exhibiting 'Stamford East', and I saw there was a 'for sale' notice on the layout. After watching it for some time I began to appreciate the exquisiteness of the buildings and the effort that had been put into making them. I had nowhere to put another layout, and thought it would be out of my price bracket, but I enquired anyway and bought 'Stamford East' for the price of three or four N Gauge engines. It was an absolute bargain!

Stamford East was the terminus of a single line branch from Essendine on the East Coast Main Line (ECML). Originally

## I had nowhere to put another layout, and thought it would be out of my price bracket, but I enquired anyway and bought Stamford East for the price of three or four N Gauge engines

the builders of the ECML wanted to put it through Stamford but, as was so often the case, the local land owner, the Marquis of Exeter, objected and the ECML was put through Peterborough instead. The Marquis soon realised his mistake, as the fortunes of Stamford declined while Peterborough's increased, so he funded the line to be built. This is why the station house at Stamford East is so ornate, because it is built in the same architectural style as his country pile, Burghley House, which is on the outskirts of the town. The line was operated by the GNR. Passenger services ran until 1957 when they were transferred to Stamford Town, but goods services continued well into the 1960s. All that remains today are the station house and the goods shed, which, with some modern buildings in between, are both now part of a sheltered housing complex.

Trevor ran the layout set in the 1960s and I have continued with that scenario. In real life there was only one passenger train, usually

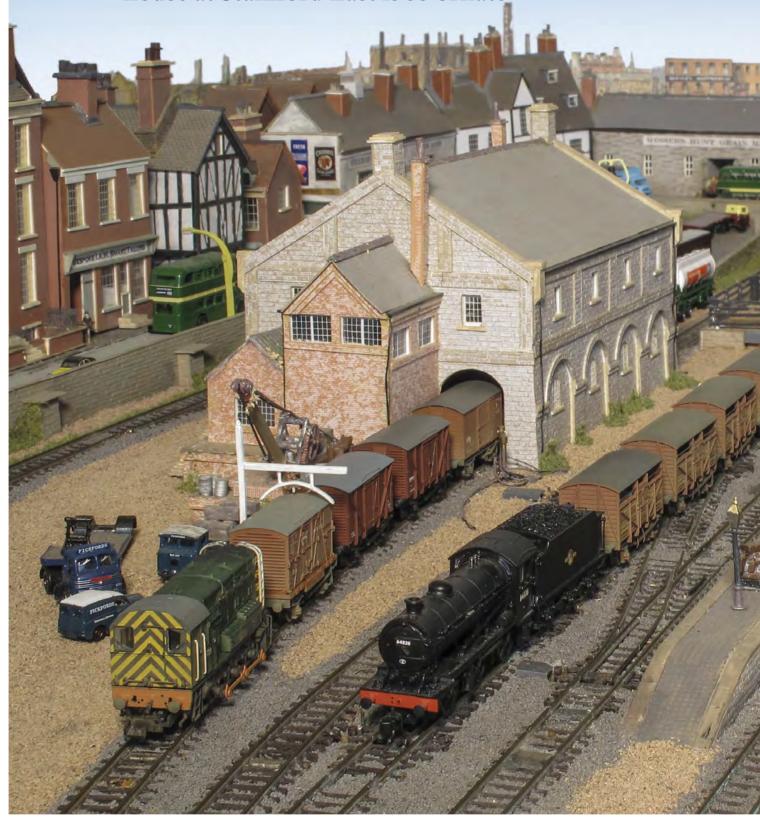
a C12 or N5 tank engine with two coaches, which ran up and down to Essendine all day, but that would be pretty boring for exhibition audiences, so I run a variety of services including a through train from London (a B1 with four Gresley coaches) and a train from the adjoining Midland line (an Ivatt 2MT with four Stanier coaches), DMUs and a selection of freight trains.

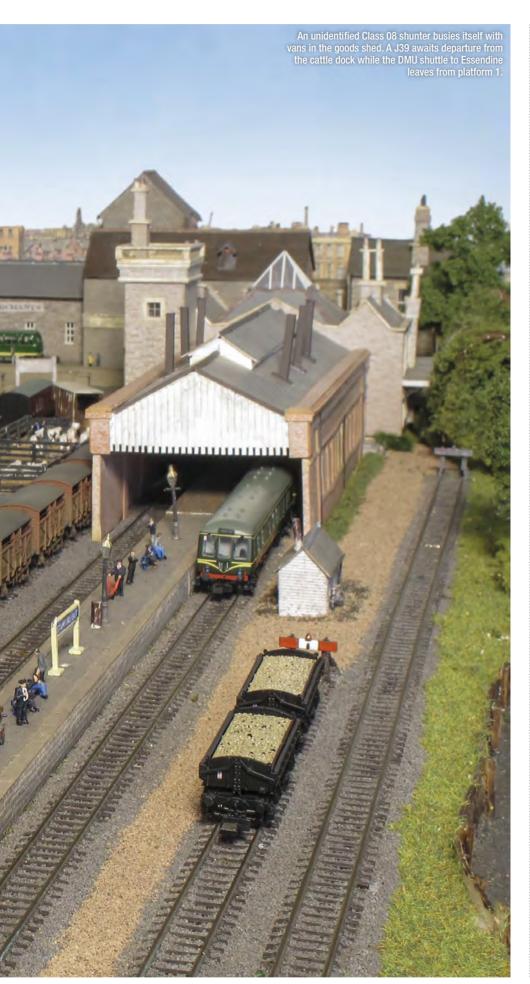
The trackplan is an exact replica of the real thing in the station area until the signal box is passed, then modellers' licence is used. Trevor used Peco electro magnets to uncouple and shunt. I was not having a lot of success fitting the metal arms to my wagon couplings, so I have opted for the Dapol couplings instead and now use two 3mm square magnets stuck together to make one rectangular magnet. The operator has to be pretty accurate in placing the vehicles he wants to uncouple over the magnets, but it does work (sometimes!) and looks pretty impressive from the audience point of view.

#### **Buildings**

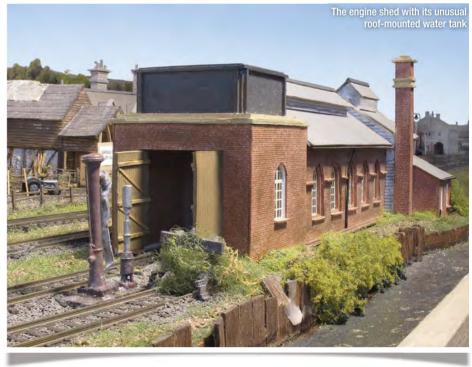
As I didn't make them I cannot go into details of their construction, but every single one is a model of a real building in Stamford. The buildings, apart from the railway buildings, are taken from all over the town and therefore the way they are placed on the layout is purely fictitious. In fact, the main street on the layout is where the railway that still exists, the Midland Peterborough to Leicester line, should be. However, the way Trevor has grouped them makes for a very convincing scenario.

The DMU shuttle passes the farmworkers cottages, which are based on the real life almshouses near Stamford Town station.



The layout is 10ft long and for storage and for transport purposes splits into two 5ft boards. When I acquired it all points were operated by the 'wire in the tube' method. There was a conventional fiddle yard on the board furthest away from the station behind the backscene. The wires for the points on the scenic side of the layout used to pass underneath the fiddle yard, which had eight roads, but the traditional fan of pointwork at the fiddle yard entrance meant that some of the roads were very short. The decision was made to replace the fiddle yard with an eight road traverser, so now all roads were of equal length. They were also halved electrically to make it possible to accommodate up to 16 trains. However, because the traverser has to slide in and out it was no longer possible to have the wire in the tube points, so the points on this board had to be electrified. This, in turn, led to the whole layout being rewired with a new control panel and a facility to have two operators working at the same time.

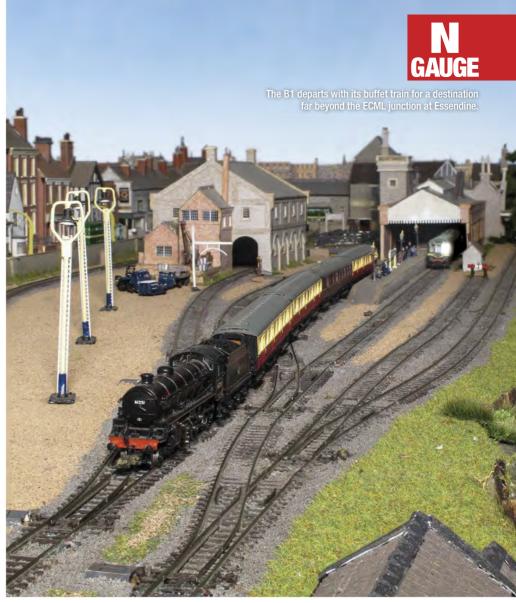




With the points now electrified it meant one didn't have to have a 10ft arm span to get to the wire in the tube levers!

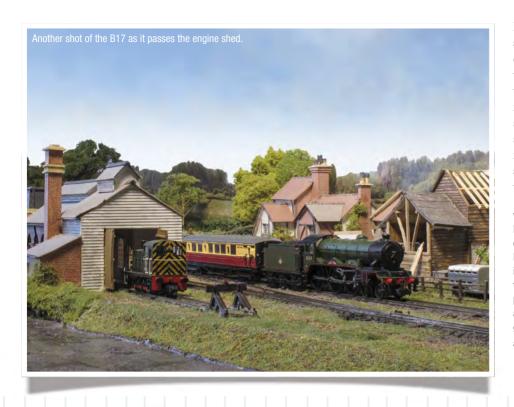
One clever feature my electrical advisor came up with for the traverser was that when trains were arriving/departing from roads one and two the other six roads had exposed ends. As such, if an operator inadvertently pressed the wrong switch and energised the road, the train would career off onto the floor. At the other end of the traverser a micro switch was fitted to every road so, as the traverser was slid in and out, only the two roads whose micro switches were pressed against a permanently fixed wooden block could be energised. Obviously, these two roads were the ones that were currently lined up with the exit tracks.

In terms of improving the layout, it will be noticed that there are no signals. I have had great difficulty in obtaining a signalling plan but, on the day I started to write this article, a new book I had ordered "Great Northern

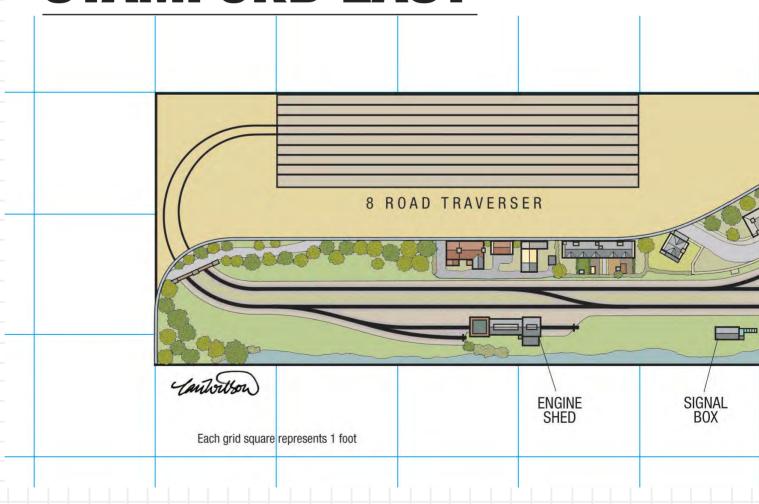


Branches from Stamford" by Peter Paye arrived in the post. In it are all the signalling diagrams from the line's construction, right through to closure. It is intended to use the Dapol working semaphore signals with modified mechanisms using miniature servos controlled by the excellent Megapoints system. If we get it right, it will not only make the signals go up and down but will also give them that characteristic bounce as they return to danger.

My thanks go to Gill Webster (Trevor's widow) for letting me have all his research. Les Richardson, for his information on Trevor's early life, Aron Moran and Dave Douglas of the Manchester Model Railway Society for their invaluable help with the rewiring, construction of the traverser and new control panel, all the many people who have been my 2nd man at exhibitions and my long suffering wife Pauline who lets me go to all these shows – maybe she just wants a quiet weekend!.

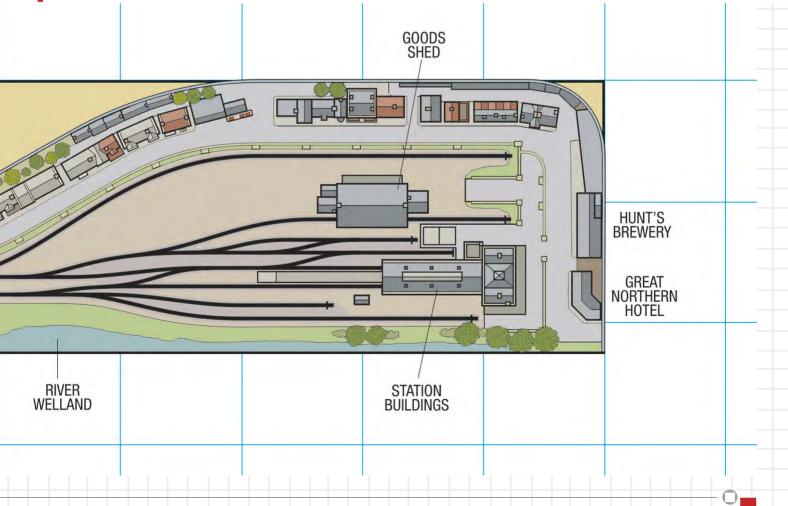

Phil Parker starts work on the latest **BRM** project layout, which is built with a rather special exhibition in mind.

I've had some interesting exhibition invitations over the years. These have seen me taking models to breweries, warehouses, exhibition centres and schools. Mostly, I just load the layout, stock and a spare operator in the car and set off on Friday evening hoping for a pleasant weekend away.

My latest invite is much the same, except that the journey will be longer than usual. Jason Shron from Rapido got in touch with **BRM** and said, "Rapido is sponsoring the 'Great British Train Show' in April 2018. This is the largest British train show in North America."

A few minutes on the web reveals that this takes place at the Jim Archdekin Recreation Centre in Brampton, Canada. I certainly wouldn't be able to drive to this one. Worse, I didn't think any of my existing layouts would fit on an aeroplane very well.

Jason suggested that we build a small layout and cover the construction in **BRM**. Fair enough, it will leave me space for some souvenirs and he's promised me a trip to the VIA Rail maintenance depot.

Anyway, I need to build a new model and it has to be portable. I'd built an N gauge

model to fit inside a plastic box back in November 2016, so my first thought was to locate a similar container big enough for a OO gauge model. The largest and strongest box I could find was 111cm x 22.5cm. Small, but I felt practical for a micro layout.

Whatever I build has got to be sturdy. I can't take a proper tool kit to the show and the journey is likely to be more arduous than most. The first step is a proper baseboard, so I contacted Justin Noble at ScaleModelScenery, who agreed to make a board as an experiment. He raised a problem that I hadn't considered, though – import restrictions. Canadians are rightly protective of their timber industry, so untreated wood could be an issue. MDF doesn't suffer from the same problem, so that's what the board is made from.

My plan is that most of the model will be pretty conventional, so this will be a useful guide for anyone thinking about building their own layout. Just do what I do, only bigger. And don't worry if you can't make it to Canada to see the model, as I'll be taking it along to our Doncaster and Alexandra Palace shows in 2018.

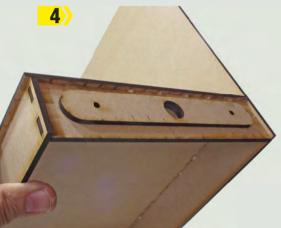


Density Fibreboard (MDF). The kit includes the nuts and bolts required to join them together. All the builder has to supply is the glue. I'm using PVA.

The instructions advise performing a "dry run" at assembly. It's certainly a good idea, as the kit is designed so that the parts can only go together the correct way around. Break out the glue too hastily and it's easy to put it in the wrong place.



Holding the corners while the glue dries is easy with a set of magnetic clamps like these from the Proses range. An alternative would be masking tape, although this might not hold the parts at right angles.



A pair of spacers need to be fixed in place where the boards are joined. Line up the holes carefully - the larger hole in the centre allows wiring to pass through the cross-pieces. Identical holes are provided the length of the board



Clamps hold everything in place and allow me to align the top and back surfaces perfectly. I could have used the supplied bolts, although I wasn't as careful lining up the holes as I should have been.



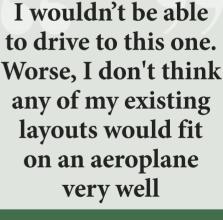
The boards fit in the transport box perfectly. The plastic box lid is deep enough to accommodate the backscene, and it will stop the board bouncing up and down in transit.

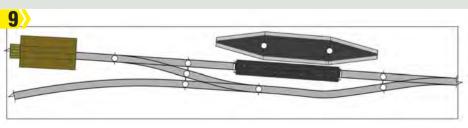


Being able to look along the layout is always popular at exhibitions so using a small jigsaw, I'm opening a big hole up in one of the end panels. At the other end, a smaller hole is opened up for the track to pass through.



Scenic work involves quite a bit of liquid, paint and glue. This shouldn't be a problem, but I'm painting the base and back with varnish to seal the surface.





There isn't going to be much space for track or scenery. Playing around with the free AnyRail6 software, I eventually came up with a practical plan. To fit everything in, I'm using the tightest points available; sadly not in the Peco Bullhead rail range, but I can use Code 75 track.



As flexi track bends, the ends will need trimming to allow them to be connected to the next section or point. Xuron track cutters do an excellent job. Snip with the flat side towards the rail you'll use and the cut is perfect for sliding on fishplates. It's possible to cut tiny lengths of rail too, so the ends of the line can be nice and tidy.

#### **PRACTICAL BRM**





Laying out the plan, things didn't look quite as tight. Having the main buildings to hand is a big help. A rather battered autocoach proves that it should be possible to run around the train with it sat in the platform.



I'm also putting slots in under the tie bars in case a future owner wishes to use different point motors or even no motors. A saw drill bit makes the hole and then is waggled up and down to create the slots.



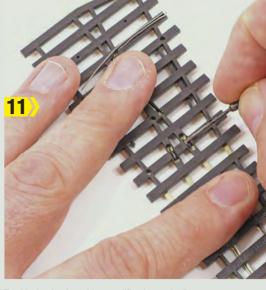
MDF resists track pins unless a pilot hole is drilled part way through for each one. Double-sided carpet tape grips the track until ballasting takes place. It needs a dust-free board to stick properly, so vacuum any sawdust away first.



A 1 1/8th inch hole is then made using a saw. It's essential to use the correct size, a metric equivalent will not do. Care is needed here and the hole is very close to the point and, even on thin MDF, needs to be made with a power drill.



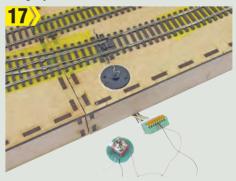
The point motors are a friction fit in the baseboard, so I made some extra plates with holes to double the thickness, simply gluing them under the board.



Tracklaying begins with a modification to the Peco points. Experience has taught me that relying on contact between the switch and stock rails for electrical switching isn't a good idea. Far better to let the point motor do this, so it's vital to remove the links on the back of the rails.



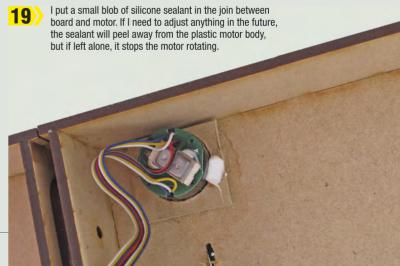
Rapido point motors are installed beside each turnout. Firstly, drill a pilot hole an inch away from the nearest rail and in line with the tie bar. The size of hole doesn't matter, so I'm using a 2mm drill bit that can be pushed through by hand.



Each motor is inserted into the hole and linked to the tie bar with a length of wire bent up for the job. A Z-shape in the bend provides a shock absorber if the throw of the motor doesn't match the point.



A handle is included in each pack, so the body can be rotated from the top of the board.



# **Station Building**

This model was first covered in the May 2015 issue of BRM, along with a similar refurbishment of a Triang signal box.



Cut from 1mm thick plastic sheet, the paving slabs are 12mm by 8mm. Sticking them with superglue individually to the platform edge allows the line to follow the curve.



Windows are glazed with Mico Mark Krystal Clear. Pop a drop on a small screwdriver and waggle it until it forms a skin. Leave the window horizontal while it dries.



A platform surface is made from wall filler spread thickly with a knife, so it is slightly higher than the edge stones. Leave this to dry overnight.



Smooth flush with the edge stones using medium sandpaper on a block. It's a messy job so have a vacuum cleaner handy. The colour used is Pheonix Precision 'faded tarmac'.





Self-adhesive posters are provided with the set, although they are too large for the noticeboard. News ones are made from white sticky labels with the text no more than pencil scribbles.



Slaters embossed brick Plastikard is fixed along the front of the platform using a mild solvent glue, although superglue would work just as well.



The bricks are painted with a mortar shade and coloured with brown pencil crayons. A dusting with weathering powders completes the job.



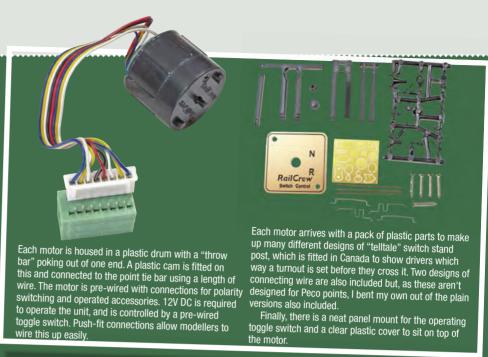
Fencing is carefully cut free from the moulded clips and fitted into 3mm diameter holes drilled into the back edge of the platform.

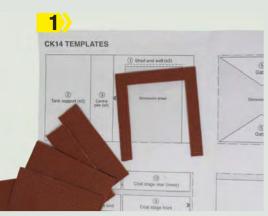
# Railcrew Switch Machines

Rapido asked me to use their new "Switch Machine" point motors. Since I've not seen them used before, it seemed an interesting part of the project. They are definitely aimed at Canadian modellers, but that doesn't mean that UK enthusiasts can't give them a go

# **Engine Shed**







Following the plan provided, many of the parts have to be cut out. I've chosen to build my model in brick rather than the stone intended by the manufacturer.



The hardest job is cutting neat curves for the tops of the windows. A circle cutter is the least difficult way of achieving this and the Olfa model I'm using is widely available.



Brick arches are included in the kit and help cover up any less than perfect cutting around the window tops. They are available separately too for scratch-builders.

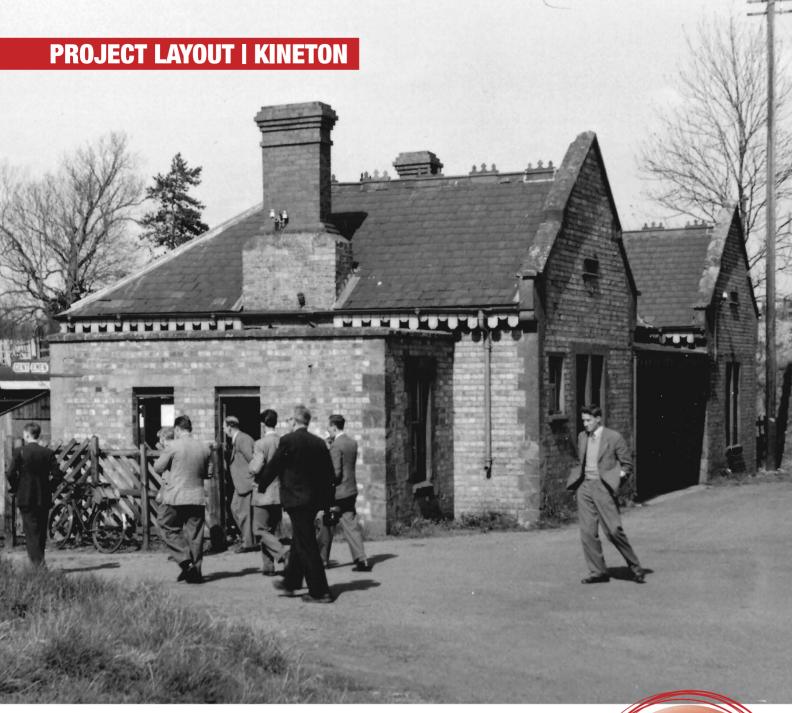


Rather than trying to chamfer the walls, I butt joint them and then scribe the brick courses once the glue has hardened using an Olfa plastic cutter.



Painting starts with a coat of Humbrol 121 (Pale stone), which is left to dry overnight and then coloured with pencil crayons. Lots of weathering powders follow.





# STRUCTURES FOR KINETON

Mike Collins, Exhibition Manager of Leamington and Warwick Model Railway Society updates us with progress on the club's 2mm finescale layout.

Te last reported on the development of our new finescale layout 'Kineton', a station of the former Stratford & Midland Junction Railway, in December 2016 BRM. The bare baseboards and prototype demonstration

items were displayed at the club exhibition in March 2017 and it was surprisingly well received, many commenting that they enjoyed seeing an exhibit that was 'work in progress' - a long way from being the finished product.

Development is behind schedule because the team objective is to produce a highquality model. We've not compromised on development time by being bound to a specific end date. Quality of the final product has been all important and, as a result, we

have rejected and re-worked items to achieve our objective.

'Kineton' appeared at the Warley National Exhibition last month and will appear on the exhibition circuit, including at BRM shows. We're continuing this 'show and tell' approach at appearances in 2018, encouraging interaction with the public.

Research has been an important part of the project and the team continue to investigate the latest technologies and develop innovative ways of applying these to the railway modelling hobby. We're experimenting with a new range of industrial LED lighting that we can tune for light intensity and colour mix to give optimum lighting, regardless of venue lighting conditions.

While those modifying the baseboards, building track and the basic landscape continued to learn and correct errors. those members working on buildings were experiencing the mixed blessings of having real buildings to model, rather than generic items.

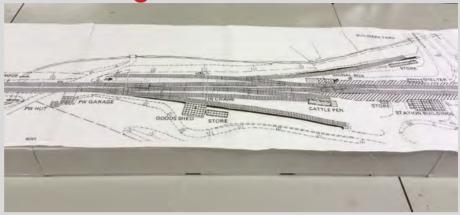
The decision to model an actual location, Kineton in Warwickshire, on the former Stratford & Midland Junction Railway, brings with it the joys of having real buildings to model, rather than generic items. The entire site is now an industrial estate, however, many historic photographs of the station are available which can be used for reference, although pictures of parts of the buildings and structures have yet to be found.

An advantage of modelling a rural station is that there are a relatively small number of buildings and structures to build. To plan what was needed, the largest scale plans that could be found; in this case from the National Railway Museum (NRM) at York as prints from microfilmed originals, alongside photographs, enabled the identification of the buildings and structures that would be required.

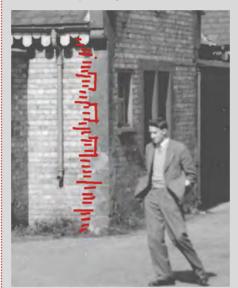
A list of just over a dozen buildings, of varying importance, and slightly fewer structures, as well as minor items such as lights, signals and fences was drawn up. Of these, only two items exist today - the road bridge that is filled in underneath with rubble from demolished buildings, and one end of the culvert under the yard with the stream flowing from it.

The greatest effort to build accurate replicas was concentrated on the primary railway buildings such as the station building, the signal box, and the linked goods shed and provender store.

# Calculating dimensions



Some of the dimensions were obtained by scaling large scale plans. The copies of the BR plans from the 1950s were prints from the microfilms, meaning that the original scales could not be guaranteed to have been maintained accurately. Fortunately, there was one key dimension on the plans that made it possible to calculate the scale of the originals. By measuring and scaling, a reasonable approximation of the sizes of the buildings was obtained. This was done by counting items of a known size such as bricks, valancing, and window panes.



Initially, the scanned photograph was scaled up to feature a section of wall. The contrast was adjusted to highlight the mortar lines. Most period photos are monochrome, and for this task any that were in colour had the colour removed to make the task easier. As bricks were counted, a coloured mark was made on each one counted, with a dash on each tenth brick, in case of losing count. Most buildings after 1850 were built with a side facing of a brick 9in long x 3in high and an end facing 4.5in wide or 229mm x 76mm x 114mm including the allowance for



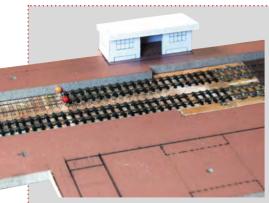
As photographs were often taken at odd angles and focussed on trains and people, it can be hard to count bricks towards the back of a photo, and this is where station valancing was found to be useful. Valancing planks are generally painted in white or cream, and have distinctive repeating shapes that show up more clearly on photos. A good clear section was found, where valancing could be seen clearly against brickwork, and the width of the planks was calculated by comparison with a number of bricks



While scaling up photographs we found that the valancing planks which appeared to have semi-circular ends were just square ends with the corners sawn off. In N gauge this difference is too small to reproduce manually, but could be incorporated in the laser-cut drawings.

Window panes tend to be a common size within each floor of a building, and to be evenly spaced. Using this helped particularly with buildings where perspective in the photographs was an issue.

#### **PROJECT LAYOUT I KINETON**



Using the estimated plan dimensions, templates for the main buildings and the platforms were cut in MDF. These allowed the team preparing and building the track to ensure that clearances were adequate. As a result, the positions of several points were slightly adjusted on the full-size design, prior to track construction, to achieve the clearance required between the through line and diverging sidings at the platform ends



Two separate layers of MDF used for the platforms, will allow the platform surfaces, together with attached buildings and details, to be removable. This means that a baseboard joint under the platforms can be effectively concealed and the two platforms surfaces, with their attached fragile details, can be transported in a separate custom-built carrying case, rather than on the baseboards. This approach may also be applied to the station yard (directly adjacent to the station building) and platform in order to hide even more of the baseboard join. To disguise the edges of this removable piece they are designed to lie along scenic features, such as the foot of an embankment.

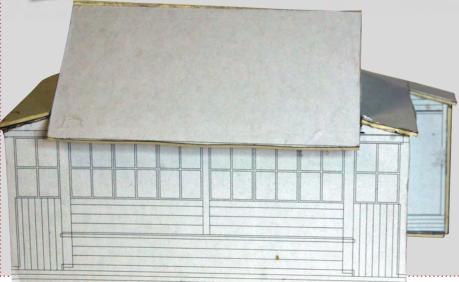


A few years after the closure of Kineton to passenger traffic in 1952, the platform fronts were cut back to allow larger locomotives, particularly from the former GWR to haul heavy goods services along the line. One modelling option being discussed is to produce a second set of platform surfaces showing the station in this era. This would allow us to exhibit using different rolling stock showing the line as it was in the 1960s.

The baseboards and prototype demonstration items were displayed at the club exhibition in March 2017 and it was surprisingly well received



Although the layout construction team had templates of the buildings to work around, we prepared cardboard mock-ups of the principal buildings. These were compared with photographs to ensure the proportions looked right, but also to ensure that difficult-to-measure areas such as roof intersections had been calculated correctly. In some cases, windows were just drawn on, in others they were cut out. The mock-ups were structural only, with no attempts to texture or colour the surfaces.





In the case of the signal box, two sources were found for the design. An article in the January 1964 Model Railway News magazine in the club library contained drawings of Ettington box, (the next station along the line), which was built to the same design, and these provided an excellent reference for Kineton box. However, Kineton box had been extended to accommodate a larger lever frame, and although there were many photographs of it, no drawings have yet been found showing the dimensions of the extensions; so the photographs were used to modify the drawings. The modified structure is still very small and fiddly, so a larger 1:48 scale version was built from the drawings to show up possible problem areas. This was found to be well worthwhile in getting the drawings right, and in ensuring that the building would go together correctly.

#### Other structures





A variety of media are being used to construct the buildings. The default material is cardboard, with the addition of etched brass and laser-cut parts. In general, the use of embossed plastic sheets and plastic kits has been avoided as, in general, their surface textures are too coarse. Crisp accurate cutting is essential in N gauge and other small scales, so etched brass window frames have been used where they are available in suitable sizes.

Where appropriate proprietary items have been used for the structures other than buildings. Photographs show the types of fencing used in different areas around the station, the type of loading gauge and milepost used. The ground plan showed two narrow structures in-line with each other in the up yard: one a corridor clerestory-bodied coach mounted on brick piers. Checking its length allowed us to select a suitable brass kit, and comparison of its length with the other building suggested that the shorter one is the right length for a 12T van body, similarly mounted. This will be converted from an existing model. A major feature, and the only significant item still standing in the immediate station area, is the Warwick Road which crosses over the line adjacent to the station via a brick-built bridge, seen in the distance of the picture, left. Examination of plans, photographs and walking over the area, showed that it's not perpendicular to the railway line, and that the wing walls aren't symmetrical. The road runs on a variable gradient, and by comparing spot-heights on Ordnance survey maps and interpolating the points where gradients change it was possible to prepare a profile for the road as it crosses the baseboard. The road and bridge surfaces were constructed from a single piece of flexible plywood, grooved underneath to allow gradient changes and supported above the baseboard surface on wooden blocks. Like the buildings, cardboard mock-ups of the bridge walls were prepared and adjusted, trimming until the angles looked correct before the final walls were cut, brick-papered, and attached to the plywood structure. The road-bridge illustrates the philosophy that has been followed while preparing the buildings and structures for this layout. We've had to make the best estimates of the prototype that we can manage, based on remains, photographs, and other documents, and then construct prototypes to match those estimates, adjusting where necessary to look right. The deadlines for building this model have meant it's not possible to research every last detail, but the resulting models should reflect the prototype and look as realistic as possible.



# BUILD A COOPER CRAFT AEC MONARCH

A stalwart of 1930s haulage, an AEC Monarch could add much authenticity to your period layout. Michael Russell sourced a bargain kit as a way forward.

**♦** he Cooper Craft kit of the AEC Monarch Lorry has sold in large quantities over the years - over 140,000, I understand. The kit has obviously been a success, but it can be improved with a few simple changes. The following instructions assume that you are working with an unbuilt kit, although it's possible to rectify a completed model if you are careful and are willing to embark on some re-construction and a paint touch up. You should follow the kit instructions supplied by the manufacturer, except where I have indicated otherwise. The finished model is hardly a definitive build of the Monarch lorry, but I think it's a big improvement on the version built 'from the box'.







The wheel is upgraded by fitting two bands of 0.25mm plastic card and holding in place with a clamp until dry a clothes peg works well. Add one band and wait for the glue to set before completing the second. Add filler to conceal any gaps and file smooth when dry.





To add wheel treads, cut four pieces 0.25mm in width from 0.25mm plastic card for each tyre and stick these on using the same method as that used to increase the wheel diameter.



These are the sub-assemblies that I identified for painting. For any kit, you can work these out by looking for areas that will be hard to reach when assembled. Once dry, they can be fitted together as per the instructions supplied with the kit.



Use 0.33mm brass wire to form a starting handle and windscreen wipers. Use a chemical blackening process on these so that you don't need to paint them.



To allow for the increase in wheel diameter, the suspension must be raised up. Add two small squares of 0.25mm plastic sheet under each axle mounting point. Here the raised front axle is depicted.



I altered the body shape by adding a piece of 0.25mm plastic card to the windscreen opening. Hide the seam with a small strip of beading cut from the same width of plastic sheet.



I made a new windscreen from clear styrene sheet and fixed it using Glue 'n' Glaze. Use the original kit supplied item as a template. I filed the other glazing pieces from the kit to achieve a flush fit, which looks much better.



Raise the rear axle in the same way and at the same time file down the lower inner edge of each mud guard to accommodate the larger wheels. You won't need to remove much material. The cab mud guards also need altering in this way.



Build the body as per the instructions for your variant of the kit. I brushed any wooden areas with a brass wire brush to enhance the grain effect.



Glue the wheels to the chassis and leave to dry upside down for a least 24 hours before righting.

- In this kit, I glued the windows in place with PVA and also the cab roof and truck body. The main reason for this was to avoid damaging the clear plastic components.
- Clear plastic items are easily scratched, especially if they've been rattling around inside your scrap box for a while. I gave the windscreen a coat of floor polish to hide the worst of these.
- Kits aren't necessarily accurate and may contain compromises. Do some research and don't be afraid to change the build or make improvements as you see fit.

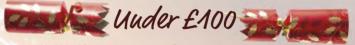

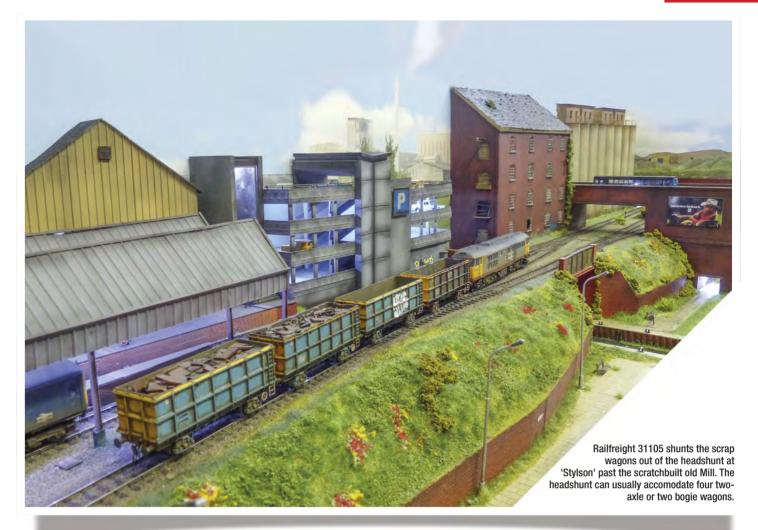

# A MULTI-TIERED APPROACH

I designed 'Stylson' to be set on three levels - a lower level canal and embankment, the railway crossing and the high level being made up of large industrial buildings.

The main scenic board was built in two sections, the lower with a canal was built first, then the higher track section built separately. This allowed the canal section to be built with Deluxe Materials Aqua Magic, and left to set while the track was laid and wired on the upper section.

We wanted the track to look as realistic as possible, so hand-built points were



constructed to B6 templates using copper clad sleepers and DCC Concepts' Legacy track. To give the track a realistic finish we used Legacy N gauge ballast and weathered it with an airbrush.

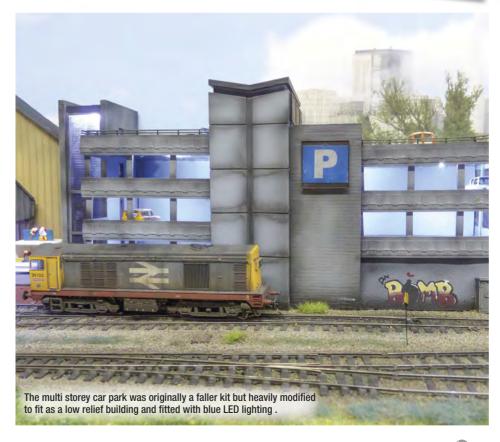
The upper section is 4in deep, this meant that housing the Cobalt point motors was easy as they would be hidden away but still easily accessible through inspection holes in the lower board.

The point motors are operated through a DCC Concepts Alpha LED push button system - a fantastic system; that's easily fitted and easy to maintain.

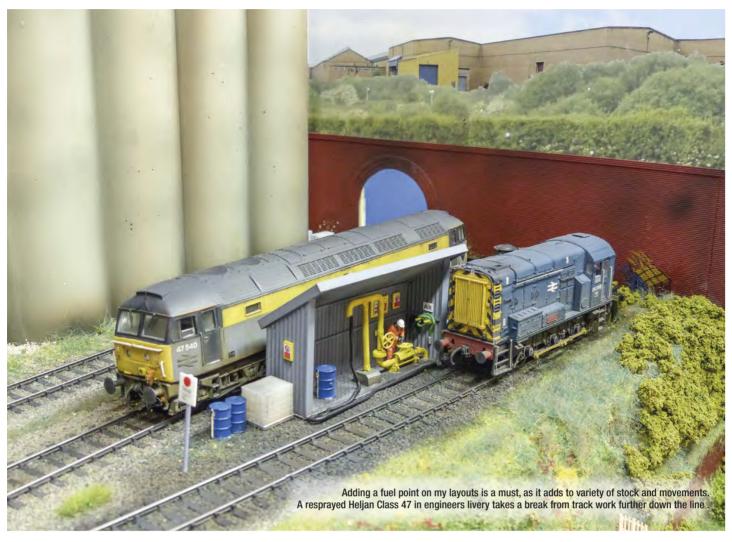

# LET THERE BE LIGHT

Lighting is really important on a layout, which is why we use LEDs as they last longer and don't get hot. Different coloured LEDs can be used depending on what part of the layout is being lit or what era you are working in. For 'Stylson' I used a fluorescent strip light with a blueish tinge. I would always recommend temporarily placing the

LED on the layout to check the spread of light before fixing it permanently.

The embankment is my favourite part of the layout as it breaks up the northern grime with lush greenery. The embankment was created using a base layer of 2mm static grass in several layers, then adding taller grasses with spray mount in the areas required. Further foliage and shrubbery was added for realism - I especially like the overgrown look.

I like to add pockets of detail on our layouts; such as a fuel point with lots of grime, barrels and pallets. The station was also packed with lots of station details like passengers and signage.

# ATTENTION GRABBING

Keeping the public's interest in a layout is essential for any exhibition. This is why we are proud of all the details we are able to add on our "Little Layouts". Running the layout is good fun and we use a variety of stock ranging from Class 128s, two-car DMUs for the passenger and parcels stock and a large variety of freight stock from Class 08s, 20s, 37s, 47s and 56s. All the stock is ready to run

and has been fitted with DCC sound and weathered by Paul Wright, our resident DCC and weathering professional. The fiddle yard is only 2ft and has a single line which makes manoeuvres interesting with lots of light locomotive moves to the fuel point between small passenger services.

## AROUND THE CORNER

This has been an enjoyable layout to build and has combined all the skills of everyone involved with The Little Layout Company. Our next step is to add realistic signalling, more detail and build rolling stock for upcoming shows throughout 2018.

# James Styles' building techniques



I make the buildings following a tried and tested approach, making them out of anything I have laying around, however I tend to stay clear of paper and cardboard because they're likely to be damaged by damp or water.

Plastic is the best material for making stronger and more resilient buildings.

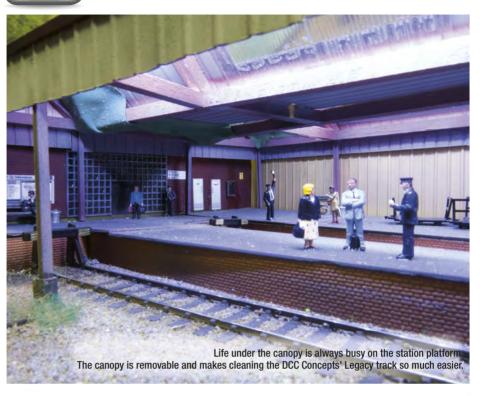
The basic structure of the bridge and derelict mill was made from foamboard.

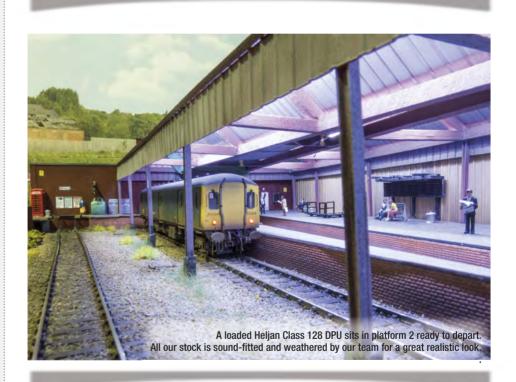
Once happy with size and clearance I covered them with embossed Plastikard sheet.

The structure is sprayed with red primer and weathered with an airbrush. The derelict mill took a little more work because I wanted the roof to look unloved.

Here I got really creative and asked my wife to keep all the glossy junk mail, using it to make each roof tile

The windows were laser-cut and made to look dirty with weathering powers. If you want to add graffiti you can buy downloadable graffiti art, but I like to be creative and paint my own with acrylics and a fine brush.

My modelling career started when I was 10 years old in my Dad's shed, not modelling as such, but creating scenes of trains crashing into cars on the tracks of my Dad's pride and joy. 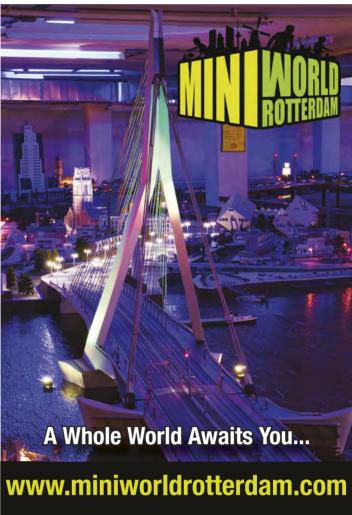

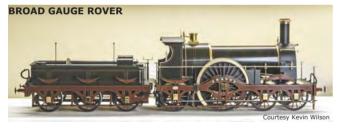

Dapol has taken delivery of livery samples of its London and South Western Railway 0-4-0 tank locomotives. The five mainstream liveries of 30089 in BR black with early crest. 30096 in BR black with late crest, No. 90 Caen in lined brown, Normandy in black and No. 88 in Southern black with green lining are to be complemented by Dapol Collector's Club exclusive No.91 in LS&WR green.

The 25 compact locomotives (five of which were built later by Drummond to a similar design and merged with the B4 Class) were built by the LSWR at Nine Elms between 1891 and 1893 and saw use on Southern branchlines and docks with tight track radii. Notable users included the Poole Quay Line, Hamworthy Freight Branch and Southampton Docks.

Largely replaced with larger 0-6-0T 'USA' dock tanks at Southampton Docks, most locomotives would endure a career of 50 years, the last until 1959.

Dapol's design team are currently scrutinising the models ahead of approval, with final delivery expected in 2018. Progress as it develops on the project can be found on Dapol's website under its 'product development' page, or by searching for 'LSWR B4'.

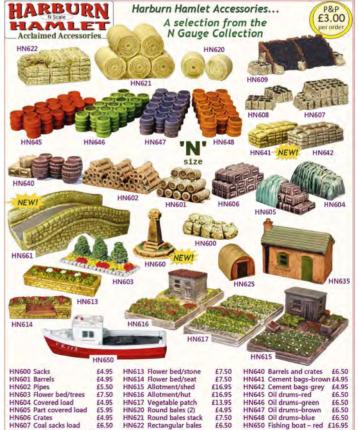

### HORNBY R3555 BR 4-6-2 'PRINCESS CORONATION' 46256 SIR WILLIAM A. STANIER F.R.S

The penultimate 'Princess Coronation' to be built, costing an estimated £21,411, No. 6256 was built to Stanier's design, but modified - as with last Class member No. 6257 - by George Ivatt. Named in honour of its original designer, it was also the last 'Princess Coronation' to be built under the LMS. This locomotive saw a re-design to the front edge of the tender, which was now fitted with Timken roller bearings. The bearings raised the mileage between general overhauls from 70,000 to 100,000. A larger superheating area, redesigned rear frame and cast steel trailing truck, rocking grate, hopper ashpan and re-designed cab-sides were all characteristic of these later locomotives, which Hornby has captured to good effect. Part of the last class members to be withdrawn in October of 1964, the locomotive would spend some time at Crewe North before being scrapped at John Cashmore's in December of that year. Also available as early-built single chimney variant No. 6231 *Duchess of Atholl* in LMS crimson (R3553) and 46235 *City of Birmingham* in BR green with TTS Sound (R3509TTS). 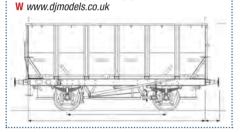

# **HORNBY PRINCESS CORONATION CLASS 4-6-2**



West Coast route to slay Shap and best Beattock. As a boy I was enthralled by O.S.Nock's account of 'Coronation' flying down Madeley bank and setting the British steam speed record in 1937 - what might have been achieved if it had the benefit of a long, virtually straight, steady downhill run? To validate that viewpoint, it should also be noted that Duchess of Abercorn demonstrated the highest officially recorded power output of any steam locomotive in Britain.

Anyway, enough of baiting East Coast enthusiasts! Hornby's model of Sir William A. Stanier F.R.S. represents the final form of this class of locomotive, with Ivatt's modifications of Stanier's design that improved maintenance aspects and is one of just two locomotives of this style - something which Hornby should be commended for tackling in the tooling permutations for this class. The main physical differentiators of these two locomotives are the splitlevel framing ahead of the cylinders, the modified rear frames and trailing truck, the shortened cab-sides and the use of roller-bearing axleboxes.

No. 6256 was the LMS's final 'Pacific', entering service in December 1947 (the final class member 46257 'City of Salford' entered service in 1948), but has been finished in 'late-crest' BR maroon livery with yellow lining and electrification warning flashes dating it to post-1960.

Hornby's all-new model was announced in November 2016 and, in less than a year, the first releases have hit the shelves with this model and Duchess of Atholl in LMS maroon livery the first to appear, and City of Birmingham coming soon.

Sales have been brisk, with some retailers selling all their stock within a few days. It was evident that this model would be something rather special, and the finished model is a visually superb representation of the real locomotive.

With the additional fitted detail, the Ivatt-modified 'Duchess' is a fine looking product.

On the rolling road there was evidence of some eccentric movement from the rear driving axle.

The maroon paint has a depth of finish that is a world apart from previous paint jobs on their Duchesses. The lining is excellent too, and the definition of printing of the nameplate, brightwork and build plates is flawless. Thin brass smoke deflectors always look better on a model, but, at normal viewing distances, Hornby's plastic rendition is pretty good. A detail that has captivated me is the representation of the seam and rivets on the top of the boiler cladding, which is a far cry from the days when we excused two halves of a body meeting at the top as a boiler cladding joint. Hornby are masters of attractive cab decoration and this extends to printing on the tender on this model. The tender's coal load is removable to reveal a representation of the steam coal pusher.

Ivatt's modified trailing axle truck looks the part, although it is fixed with no swing to it and the model comes with a flangeless wheelset fitted. The accessory pack includes a flanged trailing axle wheelset for those whose curves are sufficiently relaxed to accommodate this. The model has an adjustable drawbar to bring the tender closer to the locomotive. Well, it would if this didn't mean that the drawbar then fouls on the electrical connecting plug and socket from the





lateral slot for the bogie to pivot and move sideways. The crosshead had become dislocated from the sliders to the rear of the cylinder, which needed to be reseated, and there was a little lumpiness to the running on the rolling road, as the wheels seem to be running off-centre on the rear driving axle. The body also

## **OPINION**

This month saw the arrival of Dapol's Midland 3F 'Jinty' with stockists. Kindly sent for review by the manufacturer was No. 7480 in LMS plain black with gold lettering, but we've also had access to assess the model posing as 47501 in British Railways black and as No. 23 in Somerset and Dorset Joint Railway blue. The model is also available as 47673 in British Railways black with late crest and in LMS black as No. 16554.

# **FINAL DESIGN**

A total of 422 of the Henry Fowler-designed Midland 3F Class locomotives were built by W. G. Bagnall, Wm. Beardmore & Co., Hunslet Engine Co., LMS Horwich Works, North British Locomotive Co. and Vulcan Foundry between 1924 and 1931. Gaining the nickname 'Jinty', the Class was the last development of the Midland Railway's six-coupled tank locomotives.

# TICKING ALL THE BOXES

Ready-to-run four and six-coupled locomotives are proving popular in O gauge. Dapol has chosen a safe prototype - many a modeller is tempted by a small locomotive, be it diesel or steam. This compact model is to LMS and BR-era modellers what its GWR 0-6-0 'Pannier' is to GWR and BR (WR) modellers, satisfying a clear demand. Couple its RRP - priced comfortably under £200 for non-DCC sound versions with some stockists - and this model of a versatile prototype starts to look really attractive. Its previous Class 08 diesel shunters sold out, some finding new homes with OO gauge modellers, all in an era of rising prices and with new batches of these underway, Dapol clearly knows what buyers are demanding.

# AFFORDABLE QUALITY

Producing a well-designed model with an impressive specification to a competitive price is a challenge for

of 4182, the correct date and clearly legible Vulcan Foundry Limited, Newton-Le-Willows, Lancashire.



any manufacturer with exchange rate fluctuations, but here Dapol has succeeded. A die-cast chassis helps contribute to the 680g overall weight of this model. Atop sits a detailed injection-moulded body, complemented not by plastic, but turned brass buffers, safety valves, whistle and chimney. Don't expect working inside motion between the frames at this price point, however, Dapol has recognised this quite visible area of the model and has moulded a representation of the Stephenson slide valves.

Certainly, no corner is cut in terms of interior cab detail, with an exceptional level of decoration applied to the backhead of minimalist design. Boiler and vacuum brake pressure dials benefit from the application of decals with visible black needle and numbers. The regulator, handbrake and reverser are painted a vibrant red colour on this example, however wouldn't have lasted as such for long when in service. I'd suggest toning these down even if applying a light overall weathering on the model.

The advantage of the open Fowler cab to modellers is that a crew can be easily positioned. Nevertheless, Dapol has made the centre section of the cab roof removable, securely held with four clips. This blessing allows the cab interior to be weathered accurately.



To be found on the Midland Railway at Butterley in S&DJR 'Prussian blue' as No. 23, Dapol's model in this guise could be placed as a visiting locomotive on a contemporary layout.

Equally brilliant at this price point is the firebox flicker effect which when tested on DC power illuminated at approximately half power. Removing the four body screws to the underside of the model allows access to the internal PCB. It's here you'll find a switch allowing the firebox flicker to be disabled in DC or DCC modes. Removing the DCC blanking plate on DC models allows a 21-pin DCC decoder to be installed if desired, with provision for a bassenhanced speaker. Dapol suggests DCC Supplies 100898, 100790 and 103541 as suitable candidates. However, the boiler provides ample room for most OO gauge-orientated speakers, leaving a vast choice.

## **GOOD DESIGN**

A noticeable effort has been made to deliver a model that can withstand handling. The steps front and rear are cast with the chassis - areas which are easily knocked. If the turned brass parts part company, at least they should remain in one piece. Handrails and lateral brake tie-rods are metal too.

The sandboxes supplied on our sample weren't glued square and clearance between them and the coupling rods is tight, but at least they're to scale. The buffers are lightly sprung. I'd argue too lightly sprung, however upon mentioning this to Dapol they confirmed the springs used are the same as those in its GWR 0-6-0PT. Our sample presented intermittent problems with two buffers sticking in the housings because of the taper at the end of the shank acting as a wedge. Running a file around the rear of the buffer head will solve the problem if you encounter it.

All said and done, this model represents great value for money and with 22 variants (including DCCsound versions) from which to choose, there's a livery to suit every modeller from its introduction in 1924 until the last mainline example was withdrawn in 1967. Highly recommended. ■

# KERNOW BRITISH RAILWAYS CLASS D16/2



While we've become used to models taking several years to progress from announcement to release, the development of Kernow Model Rail Centre's Bulleid prototype diesels has been more tortuous than most.

A lack of suitable drawings and a change of supplier halted their progress for some time, but since the acquisition of a full set of works drawings in 2016, the models have come on in leaps and bounds. Seven years after they were first mooted we're finally able to review the finished article, the first versions of which are available now from KMRC. Kindly supplied for review is the first model to arrive; which appropriately depicts the first of the trio, No. 10202, in original early-1950s condition. Further editions will cover both 10201 and its twin 1,600hp sister in BR black/ silver, with BR green models to follow later. The first production batch is en route from China and should be available soon after this edition of **BRM** is published.

KMRC's research and suite of tooling also includes the third of the Bulleid prototypes, 2,000hp 10203, which was completed four years after its sisters and featured several external detail differences. This version will follow later – see KMRC's website for more information.

As is usual with prototype locomotives, 10201-203 underwent various modifications during their career and KMRC has incorporated the major external differences, such as the crew gangways/communication doors retro-fitted to 10201/202, across the three machines. Detail variations are appropriate to period and livery, based on archive photographs and works drawings.

The satin black paint provides an ominous presence, but it's the metallic silver that really catches the eye.

# First Impressions

KMRC's familiar packaging contains a history/ instruction sheet and parts list, and a securely packed model that immediately encourages you to investigate further. My first impression was of a solidly-built model with substantial weight and a high quality finish. The body is a pleasing satin black, but it's the silver that really catches the eye. Metallic paint often looks wrong on scale models, but KMRC's factory has done a superb job, avoiding the pitfalls of applying paint that is too grey or too toy-like.

The silver waistband is printed, rather than the raised beading of the original, but it's well done. Running numbers are printed in white on all four cabsides and really cry out for etched replacements.

Other features that draw attention include a moulded representation of the English Electric (EE) power unit through the large engine room droplight windows and the distinctive Bulleid-Firth-Brown 'Boxpok' wheels – smaller versions of those used on Bulleid's 'Pacifics' and 'Q1' 0-6-0s.



As above, so below, and Kernow is to be commended for the detail on the four-axle bogies.

Further investigation reveals commendable attention to detail throughout, from the extensively detailed four-axle bogies to the etched metal roof fan grille at the No. 1 end. A number of separate components are fitted; correct flat-profile steel handrails, windscreen wipers, sandboxes and sandpipes, SR pattern headcode discs and bufferbeam hoses all help to confirm a sense that this is a highquality model. A full set of white route indicator discs and black folded discs is provided.

However, it's the outstanding overall shape that really makes this an excellent model. KMRC has captured the characteristic Bulleid look and shape of the body very effectively, especially around the cab front 'face'.

# **Under the Body**

Our sample was a smooth and powerful runner, hauling 14 coaches with ease on level track. That solid performance comes from a five-pole motor within a heavy die-cast chassis, linked via drive shafts and gear towers to all six powered wheels. As with the prototype, the outer axles are unpowered pony trucks. Smooth running is also assisted by the arrangement of the bogies, which have a pivoted 'floating' inner bogie within the frames. This provides plenty of lateral and vertical movement to cope with uneven and tightly curved track. The axles themselves also have significant lateral play on their inside bearings, which should allow conversion to 'EM' or 'P4'.

A 21-pin DCC decoder socket is mounted on the printed circuit board (PCB) atop the chassis, along with a welcome innovation - for UK models at least. An in-built capacitor stores electrical energy to ensure that the headcode and marker lights stay on when power is interrupted by track dirt or dead spots.

As a final bonus, all models come with a factoryfitted 80hm 4W, 28mm round speaker as standard. This is compatible with all established brands of sound decoder, for example the ESU LokSound V4.0, but



sound-fitted models can also be ordered from KMRC for £294.99.

This is a tremendous model of a charismatic design that had a major influence on BR's first generation diesel fleet. KMRC should be commended for its tenacious pursuit of the project over several years and for producing a model that is a fitting tribute to Bulleid's ground-breaking design.



# **№** NEW MODELS



Since the merger of Lionheart Models with Dapol last year, ready to run models produced by the former company are being re-introduced under the Dapol brand in its distinctive blue packaging. First to see light of day was its Collet-designed GWR/BR suburban coaches, models which trickled through to retailers last year. New liveries for these have been announced, expected to be released early 2018.

This month saw the release of its O gauge GWR/BR Autocoach – a wise move and ideal for western region fans seeking a short train consist. It can be paired with its newly-released GWR 64XX 0-6-0PT 'Panniers', all of which were auto-fitted, or its forthcoming 45XX 2-6-2T 'Prairie', some of which were fitted with auto gear in 1953.

At 625g, largely aided by the cast metal bogies and solid metal chassis, the coach feels solid – more akin to the weight of a brass model. Its heft extends beyond the underframe with an upper plastic body that doesn't creak when handled. The glazing feels solid and is glued well, despite its ever-so-slight prismatic appearance, noticeable on only the larger windows, it won't drop inside the coach if carelessly handled.

Removing the model from its box requires nimble fingers - its tapered ends, curved roof and fragile underframe tie bars make access difficult. The latter are bent from wire, held place with plastic supports.

The clarity of detail across the model is commendable. The underframe rivet detail is surprisingly good with end steps moulded as one item for added strength. The central side-mounted steps are moulded in plastic, framed with brass handrails. These are seen around the rest of the model bent to intricate shapes, contributing to its air of "finesse". The collection of these around both ends of the vehicle is impressive, not least because of their quantity, but also their shape, which is perfectly parallel with the front of the coach, curving to form a parallel with the coach sides.

Interior detail is good – you'll find an injectionmoulded representation of the softly-sprung seating, some of which is perpendicular to direction of

travel. A representation of the crude internal wooden panelling has been thought through, in addition to the compartment doors. It's quite sufficient for what can be seen through the windows, perhaps lacking only in passengers – a job easily achieved because of the sliding roof design which gives complete interior access. In the driving compartment you'll find a handbrake and if you look really carefully you'll notice a regulator. It's painted cream on this sample, and I'll admit to having to turn the model upside down to see it, but it's there. The only downside to the interior is the large - but necessary for DCC Sound - moulded speaker enclosure. It's a shame that non-DCC sound models have the same space occupied by the enclosure, however, it's not beyond the most basic of modelling to remove if really desired.

The interior panelling is trumped only by that on the exterior, the most visible on the model. Dapol has made a fine job. The rounded inset curves mirror closely the bodyside curvature – very elaborate, very



Great Western. The ten roof-mounted gas lights, each with eight bolts on their moulded gas supply add more interest to the roof line, which also has 14 accurate ventilators, each with quite perceptible vents.

Underframe detail is more than adequate. A pair of underfloor vacuum tanks, vacuum cylinder and beautifully casted metal bogies heighten the quality of this model above standard plastic injection-moulded items. Wheels are finely detailed with a correct domed appearance and some of the finest flanges I've seen on an RTR product. The appearance of these visually is similar to Scale 7 standards, albeit the difference in back-to-backs and very nice they are, although painting them a satin black to match the bogie sideframes would be a wise first move to customise the model. All-wheel pickups are fitted enabling the easy retro-fitting of interior lighting in this non-lit version if required.

When all said and done, this model makes a great addition to the increasing availability of RTR models in O gauge. For DCC sound-fitted versions, pressing F6 triggers the speech "Right away Mr Matthews". This, interspersed with a guard's whistle, the slam of a door, a gong and many others is sure to raise a smile when operating – even on the most compact of layouts. Value for money? Yes, most certainly!



The side handrails foul on the steps. They can be bent carefully with pliers to a more accurate shape, but its better to trim the excess plastic from the step and re-fit to do the job properly.

# HORNBY MK 1 BRAKE SECOND OPEN AND FIRST OPEN COACHES



over the last couple of years, and it was with some interest that models of the Brake Standard Open and First Open were announced late in 2016 to join its CK, BSK and SK variants. The main point of interest was that these variations in the ubiquitous design haven't been offered as OO RTR products for some time and aren't within Bachmann's range of coaches.

The new design of Mk. 1 coaches was announced in 2013 and were first targeted as Railroad brand coaches with simpler mouldings and easy assembly, and also as 'main range' products with a higher standard of decoration. The same design philosophy applies to these new models, so there is continuity of appearance. The shape of the models is well-regarded and there's a good approach to near-flush glazing, although there is a little curvature evident at the edges of each window area.

Disassembling the coach by prising open the body sides shows just how straightforward the models are, with everything bar the corridor connectors being moulded detail. Similarly, the chassis is a simple construction, with battery boxes and brake cylinders added as additional parts. The bogies, BR1 for the 1959 Gloucester-built BSO and Commonwealth for the 1963 Swindon-built FO, are simple but welldefined renditions. None of that is a criticism, as the detail is well executed and accurate. The downside comes when later variations are considered. The models have end steps up to the roof and a step plate above the corridor connection, and features which were removed as electrification spread. Therefore, these blue and grey liveried models have the anathema of end steps at the same time as electrification flashes.

Roof-strip moulding has been a criticism of various Mk. 1 models, being frequently too pronounced or even completely omitted. Hornby's models are no exception, as I feel the transverse moulding on the roof is too prominent.

This year sees a range of BR corporate era Western Region numbered Mk. 1 coaches with a TSO, SO, BSK, BCK, SK and BG. I can't definitively say that the blue is too dark, but it feels it, and certainly is darker in comparison to comparable ranges. The grey looks

to have a hint of green to it rather than being a pure grey. I would say the white lining is marginally finer than Bachmann's, but lacks the same density or clarity. Unfortunately, the yellow classification lining on the First Open is a little messy at the ends and even onto the edge of the rain strip.



### OPINION

Manufacturers have a reasonable right to make profit margins to stay viable, but the pricing of the Mk. 1 coaches now sits at an RRP of £41.99. There are certainly other coaches in Hornby's range for just a few pounds extra that offer more finesse and better value; as does their main competitor at current RRPs.

#### **BRITISH RAILWAYS** The First 25 Years Volume 6:

#### Central London Southern Region

J. Allan & A. Murray

The sixth volume in this series depicting the first 25 years of British Railways covers the Southern Region lines in central London, from the terminus stations to the edge of the area bounded, by the South London Line, around four miles out. We visit the three principal motive power depots serving the stations, Nine Elms, Stewarts Lane and Bricklayers Arms, before finishing with an extensive spotting session at

Clapham Junction. This was the most complex and high density network of lines in the country and this is reflected in the photographs selected. Four pre-Grouping railways were responsible for the construction of this network: The London, Chatham & Dover Railway and the South Eastern Railway, who merged their operations in 1899 to form the South Eastern & Chatham Railway, the London & South Western Railway and the London, Brighton & South Coast Railway; all were absorbed. into the Southern Railway in the 1923 Grouping, Change was slow after Nationalisation until the 1955 Modernisation Plan began a process of extending third rail electrification, firstly on the Kent Coast lines and then in the late-1960s to the Bournemouth line from Waterloo, which saw the final elimination of steam. The Southern Region had two very distinctive modern traction designs, the Birmingham Railway Carriage & Wagon Company diesel-electric Type '3's and the electro-diesels. There was a slow evolution of the standard EMU and it was only in 1972 that the first prototypes with sliding doors appeared. Unlike earlier volumes, to assist understanding, we have included, detailed 1950s maps of the location of the principal stations and depots, showing how they fit into the capital's streets and the way they inter-connect. Platform layouts are also provided for each of the termini. As usual, the photographs span the early British Railways era through to the pre-TOPS diesels, although the emphasis is on that interesting transitional period of the late 1950s and early 1960s.

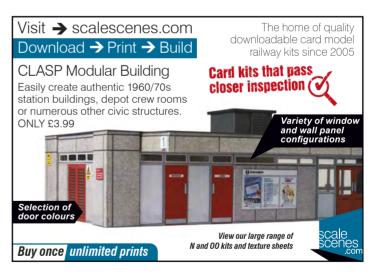




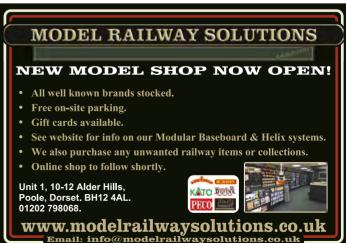












## BRM meets... THE COLLECTOR



Michael Foster's collection of British tin toy trains is compiled in four great books, although there's more in his back catalogue, as Andy McVittie discovers.

We receive a fair few publications each month at BRM Towers, but Michael Foster's books stand out easily among the many titles covering vintage railways, cherished prototypes and such. Colourful, well-researched and plainly the products of a very ardent collector, his titles are a rich resource for tin toy enthusiasts and just for general nostalgia, and are all the better for their breezy editorial style. Michael and I had corresponded a little, when the idea to meet up was hatched. What drove him to collect so exhaustively, I wondered...

AM: First things first, then - where did it all begin?

MF: Like many people I had a Chad Valley train set as a boy. I've always liked trains, though. In a pram in the 1940s I can remember watching the old LMS steam engines go by. My grandfather had a season ticket from Sutton park station to Birmingham New Street. I remember going

down to the platform to see him off. I was later a train spotter - the joy of waving at the driver, and he would sound his whistle and wave back. It was absolute magic! The real collecting started after I got married. I went up to the attic of my wife's parents' house and found an old engine 'George V'. I hadn't really seen big O Gauge engines before, and this was a toy that her father had owned since 1919. And then there was the Bob Denny shop in Long Eaton. Whenever I used to

go around the country on business, I got to know little shops like this and I used to call in – basically as a form of relaxation. I'd seen a Princess for sale for £10. This was quite a lot of money, but somebody had already



put a deposit on it. I'd fallen in love with the engine, though, but I found another one at a shop in Brighton. So then I started buying Hornby O Gauge. I was really just collecting at this stage, because I thought they were such wonderful toys.

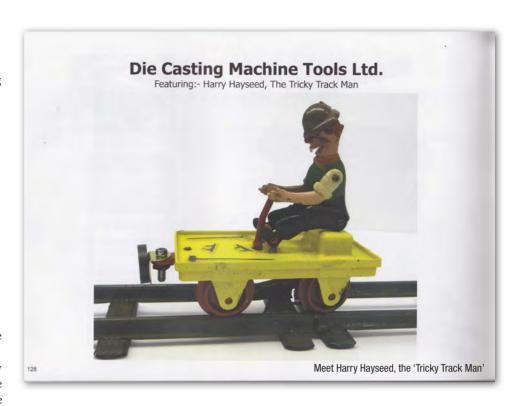
AM: So how did this love of trains turn into the writing of books? In particular, what prompted you to write your first book, "The History of Hornby Dublo Trains, 1938-1964"?

MF: Well, O Gauge in the early 1970s became too expensive for me. However, some friends of my parents gave me a whole wad of mid 50s-early 60s Hornby OO catalogues. I looked at them, and I saw there were different names and numbers, so I listed a few of them. I had in mind to maybe write a history of Hornby Dublo, like a collectors' guide. So four friends and I set about trying to identify every single Hornby Dublo product. This would have been in the early 70s. I was in sales and marketing at the time, driving all over the country, which was very handy because I could stop when I got tired and call in at a local shop or a collector in order to look at a particular model. It was important for us that we actually saw all the products going into our book, so this process took about seven years. At this point I became ill and I had a four month convalescence. I used to wake up each day and get all my papers and research on the table, and that's how I ended up writing the Hornby Dublo book, which was published in 1980. Basically, I wrote the book that I wanted to read, and it has since sold over 54,000 copies.

AM: What was it about the collecting that really appealed to you, as opposed to the running of trains or the building of layouts? MF: Collecting is about two things – pride and envy. You have pride in what you've collected yourself, and envy of your friends who have got something that you covet. It's about the appreciation of skill too. Dublo, for me, was the best in terms of strength and reliability.

AM: How did you go from Hornby Dublo to British tin toy trains?

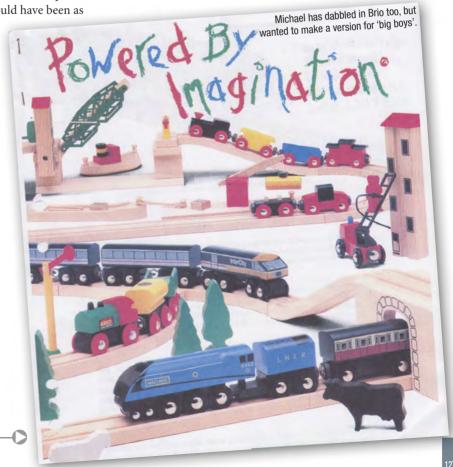
MF: I try to live within my income, and I was always interested in what I could find 'under the table' at the toy fairs I used to go to. In other words, there was Hornby and Bassett-Lowke costing hundreds on top of the table, but underneath you had all these colourful, bright and more affordable tin



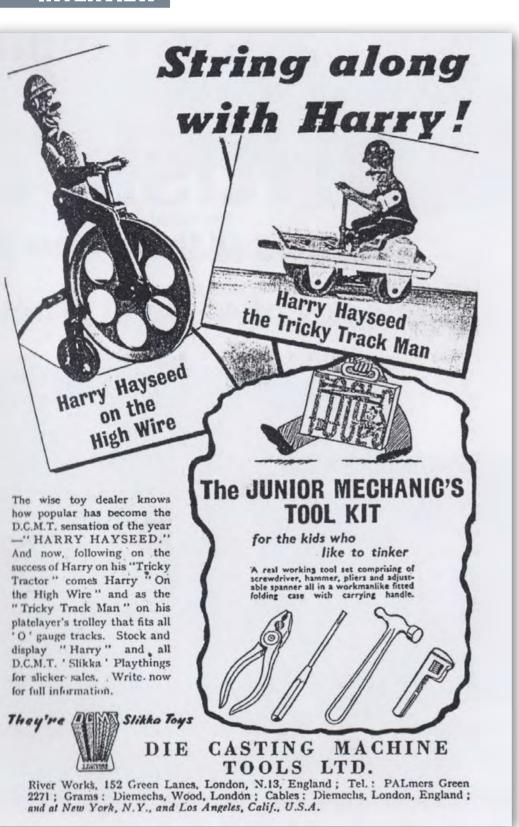
toy trains. As I saw more of these things, I started collecting them. Over the years I'd also collected, or was given, all the Chad Valley, Mettoy and most of the Brimtoy trade catalogues. This way I could see what I had and what was missing, and slowly it all started coming together. It was always my intention to try, for the first time, to write a history of all the British toy trains. I couldn't have put it all into one book, as that would have been as

thick as a church bible!

AM: Three of the four books are already in print, with a fourth on the way soon. How long does it take to produce each one? MF: Well, Michael Bowes, who took the photographs, and I started from scratch, but we get on like a house on fire. We only had three or four meetings here, although lots of email

correspondence. He takes my script and lays the book out then takes all the photographs. Each book takes about a year to put together. I'm currently working on book four, which includes the final bits about Brimtoy and Mettoy, but also what I call the 'one-hit wonders', which is all the companies that only made one product.

AM: Given your journey so far, and with book four on the horizon, what are you going to do next?

MF: I've been developing little Brio engines, again for toys that I'd like to own, but I also wanted to make a version for 'big boys'. ETS makes these powered chassis units, which I install - I have an engine here that is almost

105 years old, but it's been brought back to life because it's got a brand new 2017 power unit beneath. Basically, people send me their old engines, and I sit there like a Swiss watchmaker fitting new chassis and engines into almost anything. Using battery power, instead of clockwork, you can get up to three hours of running.

AM: Is this the end of your publishing ambitions, then?

MF: Well, once I finish book four, there's a possibility of a book five, which will be edited by Nicholas Oddy, who also edits the Train Collectors Society magazine. This will feature Bar Knight, which was a Scottish manufacturer of O Gauge, and also what he calls the 'Birmingham piddlers', which is the brass steam engines of 100 years ago and more.

AM: You have recently auctioned the collections you had amassed for books one and two, but was there anything that you just couldn't bear to part with?

MF: Yes, I've kept a couple of Chad Valley engines. There's also this lovely little die-cast toy that you can see at the end of book one - 'Harry Hayseed', which is basically like a navvy with a single tooth on a pump-trolley. I've fitted magnets so that it is pushed forward by an engine - there's no obvious connection, but the faster the engine goes the faster he pumps. It often has me in hysterics!

AM: Was it always your intention to selfpublish your books, rather than approach one of the specialist publishers?? MF: Well, I've approached large and small publishers, but not one of them was interested. Printing and publishing has changed so much in recent years, and I think a lot of people perhaps overestimate the market, printing 2000 copies to sell just 600 and the rest are remaindered. In publishing the books ourselves we've sold over 750 copies of book one so far, and I've only got four copies left of the entire run. The books themselves are not meant to be heavy industrial tomes, they're to give facts and put some flesh on the bones. The models really speak for themselves - you could almost read the books like comics, and understand the history through looking at the pictures.

AM: Apologies for asking what is probably an obvious question, but what would you say is the 'crown jewel' in your entire collection?



MF: I think the Hornby Princess is a stunning and iconic model, but I've got a little Mettoy engine that was only made in 1951. It's a light blue 0-4-0 West Country engine. To me it's the prettiest little toy engine. My dear friend Roger Brown used to be the development director at Corgi, and Mettoy was part of their range. He had this in his collection, and I yearned for it. Then I worked with him on a project – I can't remember what it was now, but he thanked me for my help and gave it to me. So it has great sentimental value for me, and it is a mark of our friendship. I'm hoping that this model will be on the cover of book four.

AM: You plainly have enough in your collection to fill four, and maybe even five books. I've got to ask, how do you store it all?

MF: I used to have everything in six foot long trays, which was fine when I was young and fit. I had about ten of these, but I came to a stage where illness meant I couldn't move them around. So I ordered 200 of these smaller boxes. They are all numbered, which means that I can sort them more

easily. Space really is an issue, though, which is why we have sold the collections from books one and two.

AM: We've seen your collection through your books, but are you going to display it anywhere too?

MF: I have done, once or twice, but it's a lot of work – too much for me. Also, there are too many to display at once, so the books really are the best way to see the collection. I'm not into Twitter or Facebook, or using the internet as a means of displaying the collection. I suppose it could be done, but it's a question of time, as I do also have a life outside of model railways!

AM: Finally, in all your experience as a collector, what advice would you give to others looking to start collecting too?

MF: Enthusiasm for whatever you're collecting is important. In school you're never taught the most important lessons in life – one is a degree in enthusiasm and, above all, you've got to have a Masters in a sense of humour. It doesn't matter what your specialisation is, if you haven't go

enthusiasm for it you're like a flat battery. And when things go wrong, as they can and they will, sometimes the only way you can get over it is with a sense of humour.

And on that light-hearted note, we concluded our chat. Michael's own enthusiasm for collecting has carried him this far, but it appears that he isn't finished with British toy trains just yet. Book four will arrive early in 2018, with volume five a distinct possibility. In the meantime, it transpired that he's also amassed a collection of jigsaws too, which is large enough that he's inadvertently bought doubles in the past. My suggestion that he might explore that as a future project raised a chuckle, but I honestly wouldn't put it past him!

# TAIL LAMP

Santa's on his way, and he's stopping on the Isle of Man...

anta trains are a vital part of many preserved railway schedules. Volunteer Secretary Alex Brindley explains how they work on one of the smallest lines – the 34 mile long Groudle Glen Railway.

7am is just too early to be cramming yourself into a tiny steam locomotive cab to light the fire. Sensible people will still be in their beds, especially two weeks before Christmas on an island in the middle of the Irish Sea offering less than tropical weather at this time of year. So why do we do it?

Partly for the money. Our two weekends of festive services, followed by the Boxing Day mince pie specials, are an essential part of the income that keeps our little line alive. All those passengers help pay for the maintenance of locomotives, rolling stock, track and buildings.

Just as important, this is the time of year when we entertain the locals. Much of our regular passengers are holidaymakers, something that has been the case since the railway opened in 1896. Groudle Glen was one of the most popular attractions on the island and the decision to build the railway was as much to provide another entertainment to add to the dance bands, fortune tellers and playground as to provide transport to the zoo built in the cliffs.

In the winter, there are very few holidaymakers, but families want something suitably festive for the kids. Where better to provide it than in the most beautiful spot on the island?

All this doesn't happen by accident. For a start we need at least 22 staff each day, and since we are all volunteers that means prising people from their Christmas shopping and persuading them to troop down the Glen and be full of Christmas spirit. Family and friends are coerced into helping out too. It takes a special type of person to don an elf costume and appear in public, and an even more special one do it year after year!

Work starts up to five weeks before the big day. In the gap between the normal running season and December, we'll try to spruce things up a little bit.



Paintwork is touched up and repairs carried out, fairy lights appear, tinsel is put up and our stations find themselves renamed. Lehn Coan becomes 'Santa's Halt' and Lime Kiln Halt finds itself the 'North Pole Halt'. Then it is time to stock up on mince pies. Over the five operating days we go through 3500 of them.

Our first season was in 1984 and traffic numbers have grown every year, we'll now see over 4000 passengers, a growth of over 1000% since we started. Ticket sales alone show why this matters to us.

New last year was another clever bit of marketing – a selfie photo frame. People pose behind the big festive frame and we post the photos on our Facebook page. They put them up on their own pages, sending the happy Groudle message across the world. It's a simple thing, but everyone loves it.

Not everything goes to plan, of course. 2012 wasn't a good year, with torrential rain ahead of the first weekend flooding the track and even spinning the ornamental 'Little Isobella' wheel half way up the Glen. We got through, of course. Santa's helpers kept everyone entertained and our drivers kept

the trains moving, even though slippery rails didn't make life easy.

This Christmas magic provides the final reason we do this every year – it's great fun. Okay, the early morning starts to prepare a steam locomotive might seem hard, but at least it's warm. We top and tail trains to save time at each end of the line and sometimes we have to use our electric locomotive on one end. The driver might have an easier start, but there's no fire to keep him or her toasty while they work. We have to supply them with plenty of tea for that!

Christmas is a special time of year at the Groudle Glen railway and we do our best to make it even more special for the hundreds of families who come to visit us.

Our shop does a good trade in railway gifts and I know there is a least one member of the **BRM** team who loves his Groudle Glen mug. However, the smiles on everyone's faces are priceless.

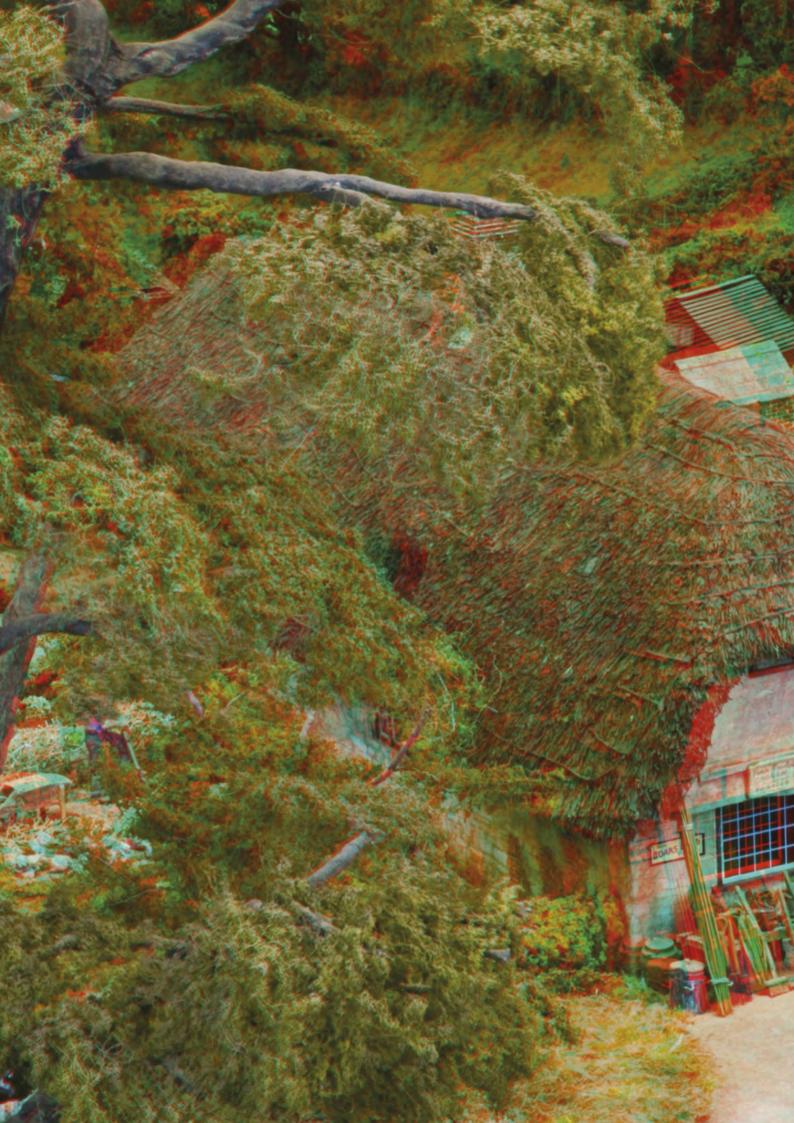


# Pendon Parva Railway Station

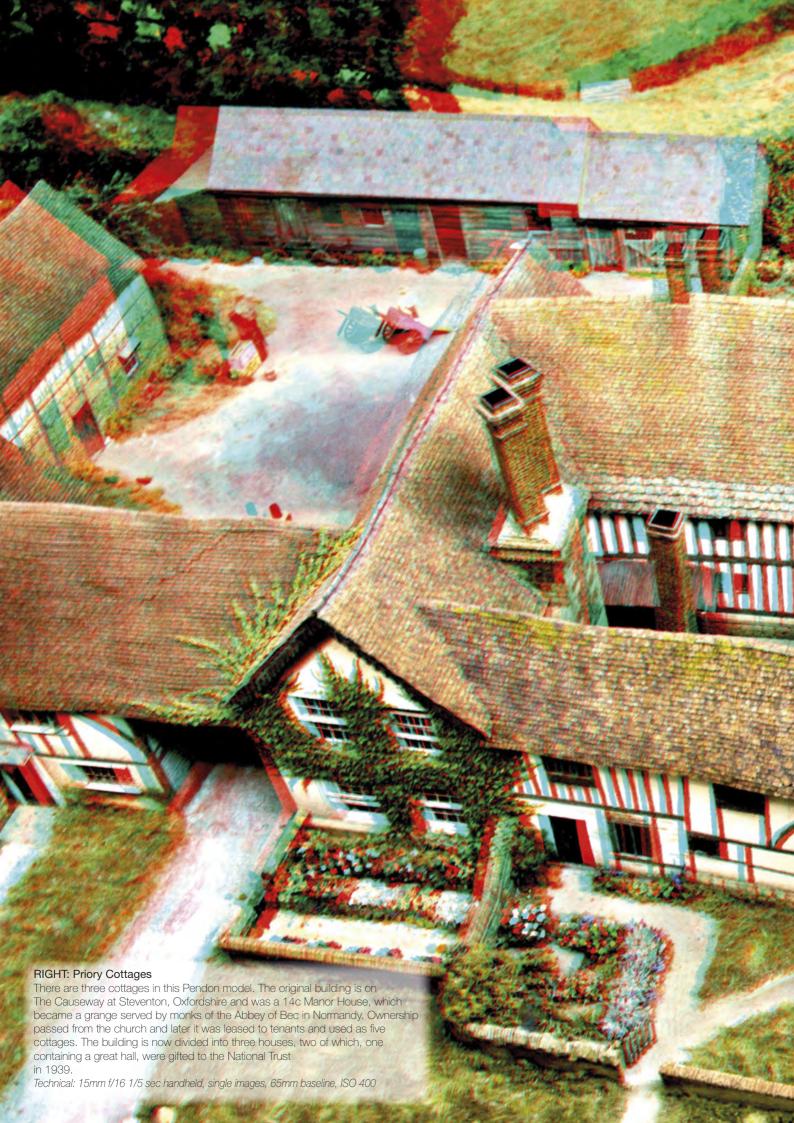

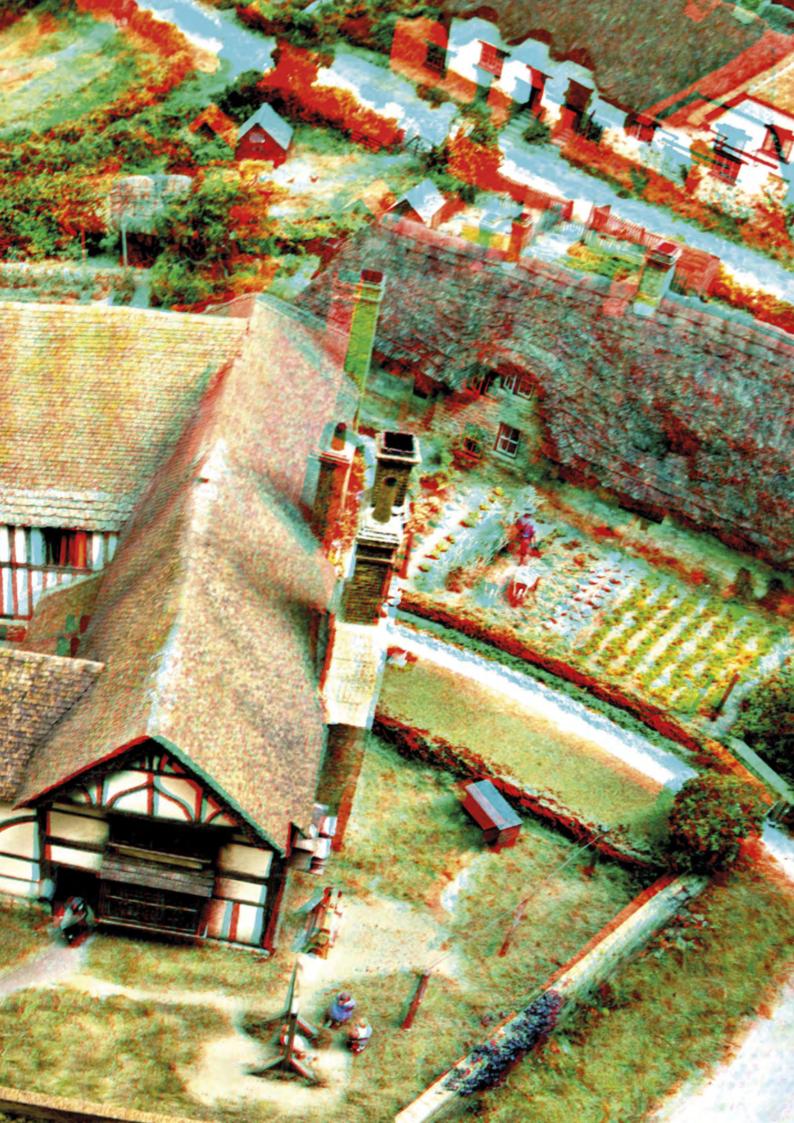




















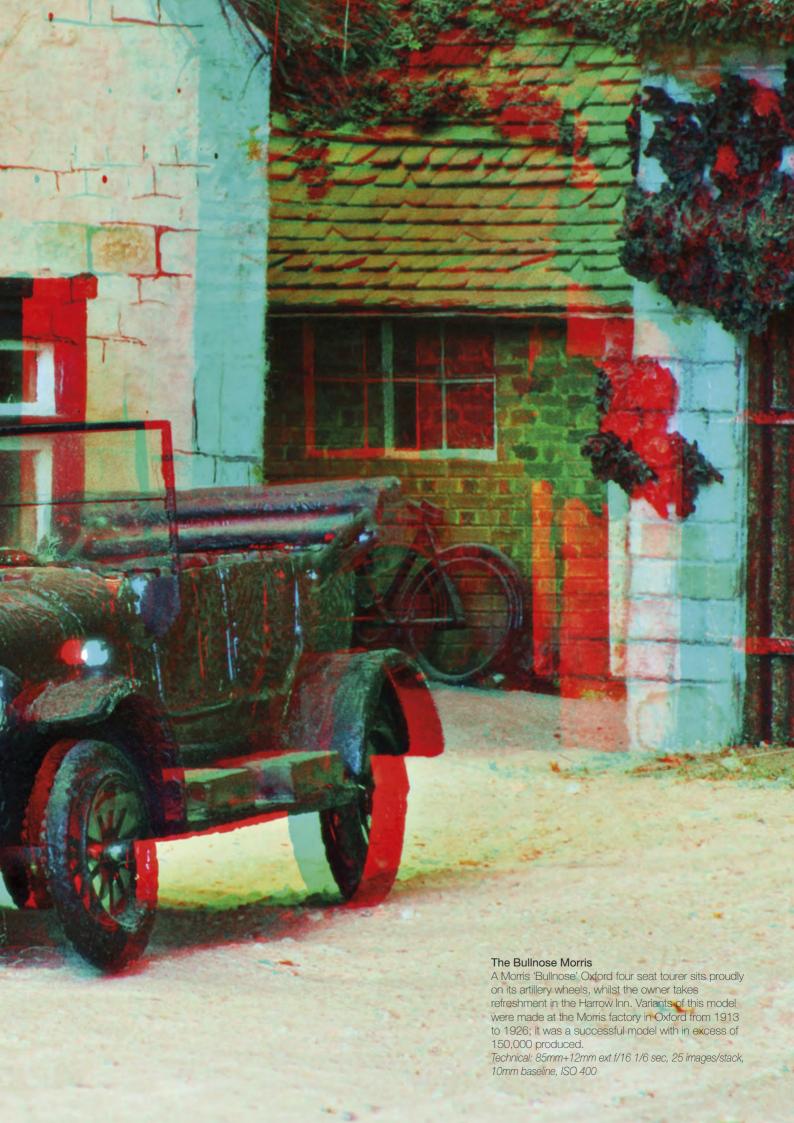






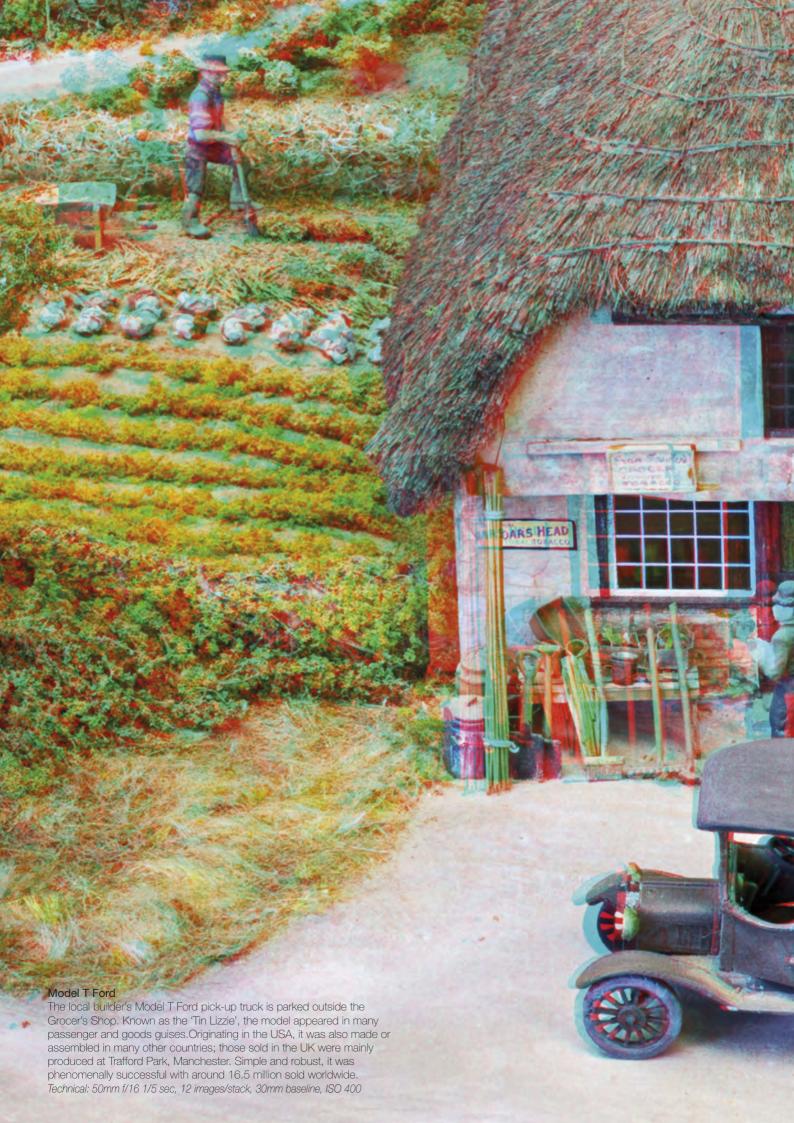






















# How do they do that?

Pendon models are set in the 1930s and this was the decade in which Viewmaster stereoscopic viewers

first appeared. After WW2 these viewers became a desirable toy and were to be found in many households in the UK and elsewhere. We have produced some View-Master reels of Pendon scenes for museum visitors to see.

But we didn't stop there. 3D photos can also be printed and viewed using the glasses provided with BRM.

# Taking the photos

Taking a stereo photograph of a real-life scene is relatively simple: you take two photographs 60-75mm apart - this being the normal range of separation of the human eyes. However, taking a stereo photograph of a 1:76 scale model scene is rather more complicated.

Taking a photograph of a scale model that looks 'real' means placing a camera in the scene as if it was being held by a miniature person with an eye separation of 1mm (i.e. at 1/76th scale). Since this isn't feasible, we used a digital camera mounted on a rail and tripod outside the perimeter of the diorama so that the camera could be moved sideways by a known distance. As the camera is further away than the model person would be, you compensate by increasing the baseline, typically to between 10 and 35 mm, always making sure that the resulting image is easy for the viewer's brain to make into a 3D image.

At close distances the depth of focus of the photo can be very small. Whereas for a normal photograph it might be acceptable for the subject to be in sharp focus and the background to be out of focus, for most stereographs this is not the case. One solution is to take a large number of photographs while varying the point of sharp focus. Typically, 10 to 20 photographs at each baseline location are needed to cover the scene depth. Each set of images is then merged using software to create a single image that is sharp throughout the depth of the scene.

In practice, the camera is positioned in four or five different locations to cover baseline variables, and we may need to take up to 100 photographs to produce a final stereo pair! It makes production of the stereographs a time-consuming business.

# The end results

The display prints in the magazine are anaglyph stereographs that are viewed using coloured glasses, in this case red and cyan, with the red filter over the left eye. The image is processed and printed such that the left eye will only see the left image and the right eye will only see the right image, thus helping the brain to fuse the images into a single stereoscopic image. We hope you like the results!

# The photographer - Paul Ellis

Paul's first photography used a 1930s Kodak folding camera with 120 roll film. His first attempt at stereo photography was a pair of photographs of an Alaskan glacier taken one pace apart with a 35mm camera in 1970. Since then he has regularly taken stereo photographs for his own interest but none have been published... until now. The stereographs of the Vale Scene at Pendon are the first 3D photographs of scale models that Paul has ever taken and he developed a special methodology for the purpose. The stereo pairs were shot using a Canon 40D DSLR camera mounted on a rail. Software used was Helicon Remote for automated focus stacks, Helicon Focus to merge the image stacks and StereoPhoto Maker to produce the anaglyph stereographs.
