#### 'SILK ROAD' Freight Train from China to London Arrives at TMC

The first freight train travelling between China and the UK arrived on the 18th January 2017 at DB Cargo UK's London Eurohub terminal in Barking. The train is operated by the InterRail Group in Switzerland, on behalf of China Railway subsidiary CRIMT. Various freight railways handle traction along the 12,000 kilometre route; DB Cargo is responsible for the section from Duisburg to London via the Channel Tunnel. The train originated in Yiwu in the eastern Chinese province of Zhejiang. It reached London in around 18 days, making it twice as fast as transport by sea. The train was loaded primarily with textiles and other consumer goods. The 34'x40' containers required are specially approved for the Channel Tunnel. The UK is just the latest destination added to the China-Europe rail link.

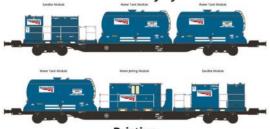

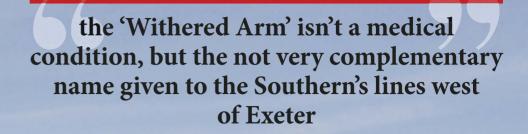

## **LAYOUT FOCUS**

lmost 15 years from the start of the project, we have recently sold Treneglos to a new owner. This article serves to record how the layout came to be created, how it changed over time and our journey to deciding to sell it. A followon article will cover some of the elements included in the design to make the layout transportable to exhibitions and some of the key things we have learned taking it to around 40 shows.

Looking back to 2003 it's hard to believe that three friends living in the Stafford area, and whose individual interests included the Somerset & Dorset, LNWR and big blue diesels, would end up building an exhibition layout based on a station on the North Cornwall Railway. It did happen, though, and we suspect that it was the result of three separate factors:

- The three of us being at a loose end at the Stafford exhibition in February 2003, and enjoying watching the trains go by on a layout called 'Cadiford Water'.
- The introduction of new, higher standard 00 RTR stock, including Bachmann's N Class and Standard 4MT tank, and Hornby's Bulleid Light Pacific.
- John going to the pub one night and getting a 'crazy idea' that we should build a layout together. He put forward this idea, with a plan, in a letter to us and we both signed up. The rest is history.

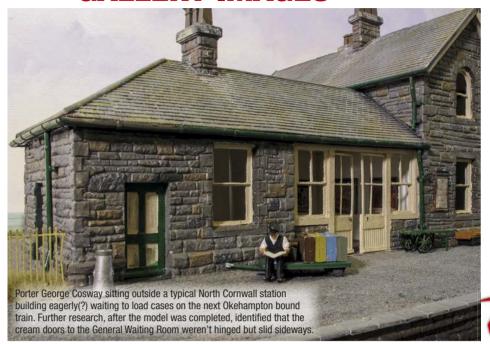
So, less than a year later, we were back at Stafford exhibition in February 2004, but this time as exhibitors with our 'Withered Arm' project layout. The 'Withered Arm' isn't a medical condition, but the not very complementary name given to the Southern's lines west of Exeter, which ran to the coastal termini at Plymouth, Bude, Illfracombe and Padstow. Of these routes the North Cornwall Railway (NCR), which ran from Halwill Junction through to Padstow, formed the inspiration for our model.

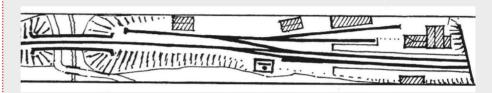
The original idea was that we'd build a relatively compact rural through station on just three 1100mm x 370mm scenic boards with a 1100mm cassette fiddleyard at each end. Something manageable and something we could easily build in a year. Having agreed the concept, the plan was amended to increase the board width to 500mm (1'8"), to give a bit more room for the goods yard sidings, and the length to 1200mm (4'), to give a bit more room for a Bulleid and three coaches in the fiddleyard.

#### Stock

If we were starting out building the layout

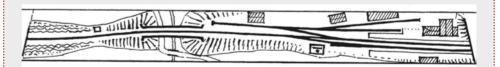


This shows the original three-board plan. Trains entered the layout from the left-hand (Padstow) fiddleyard, travelled over a three-arch concrete viaduct, past the goods yard and into the station. The station used the typical NCR trackplan and buildings from intermediate stations such as Tresmeer and Egloskerry which, with platforms scaling out at around a board length, suited our purposes very well. On this plan the two tracks that made up the loop both ran, under a bridge, into the righthand (Okehampton) fiddleyard.

Armed with John's sketch, Damian set off and in no time at all delivered three baseboards for the scenic section. Treneglos was very much not a 'flat earth' layout, as the majority of the landforms were below the trackbed. To

address this Damian cunningly built the boards almost step-like with the bases progressively rising from left to right.

The next step was for Chris to add the basic landforms to the layout prior to laying the track and wiring up. This fitted in better with the time we each had free but also meant that there was no risk of the trackwork getting damaged or receiving big dollops of plaster. It was around this stage that we became uncomfortable with the scenic exit at the Padstow end of the layout - coming straight off the viaduct gave little scope for hiding trains entering the fiddleyard. Our solution was to add a fourth board.



The extra 1200mm long section enabled us to take the line off in a cutting and under a bridge. This bridge was based on the one carrying a lane to the real hamlet of Treneglos over the NCR. This extra board changed the whole look of the layout, created a great scenic break and the undulating scenery and rock face helped plant the layout firmly in North Cornwall.

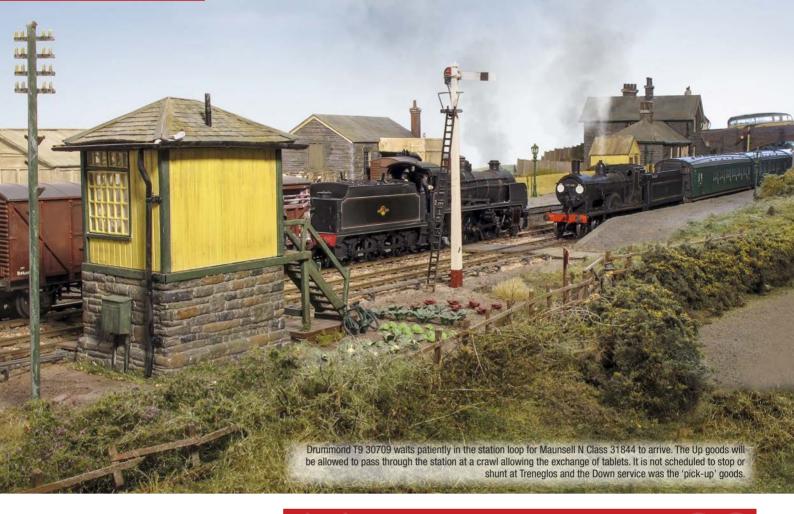
With the layout in its 4-board format we progressed the build with individual boards clocking up quite a few miles as they travelled between our houses. Boards built at Damian's, to Chris's for base scenics, to John's for trackwork and ballasting, to Damian's for electrics and back to Chris's for adding the green stuff. In the background we'd also each taken on the construction of various buildings and scenic items, the control panel, lighting rigs, displays and fiddleyard cassettes. So February 2004 duly arrived and the three of us turned up at the Stafford Showground with various bits of layout and rolling stock in tow. It all went together with a few last-minute subtle adjustments and the trains ran. We were very happy!

Thinking back to that first show, though, there were a few things that operation over the two days highlighted:

- The stock was a bit of a mishmash, not all of it suitable for, or prototypical of, NCR trains, but we ran what we were able to pull together on the day.
- The layout needed a backscene, as the view got lost in whatever was behind us.
- The right-hand fiddleyard was not easy to use as a result of two parallel tracks going off scene. The storage cassettes in the fiddleyard were too wide to fit side by side and therefore it unacceptably delayed the flow of trains entering or leaving.

now in 2018 we'd have available just about every item of locomotive and rolling stock that ran on the NCR in the BR period. Back in 2004, though, all we had were Bachmann's BR Standard 4MT tank, N Class mogul and Hornby's Spamcans. Coaching stock was restricted to some generic Southern coaches from Hornby (which looked a tiny bit like Maunsell coaches) and Bachmann's Bulleids and BR Mark 1s. There was therefore a need to build some stock!

Whilst happy to build plastic coach and wagon kits, we decided that we needed help with brass kits. Here we enlisted the skills of Geoff Cook, another member of the Stafford club, and he built us a Finney Drummond T9 4-4-0, DJH BR Standard 3MT tank and a three coach rake of Bulleid / BRCW Comet coaches. Hornby later came to our rescue on two key items of stock for a NCR based layout: a RTR T9 (2 cab and 2 tender variations) and Maunsell coaches (which formed the mainstay of local services). Since then, the picture for RTR stock improved every year, with the only omissions now being the Maunsell U and U1 2-6-0s that were occasional visitors to the NCR.

A plain white MDF backscene was added in time for our second show at Macclesfield

in April 2004. Visually, this was a big improvement and, along with the lighting pelmet, fiddleyard screens and information panels, gave the professional presentation we wanted. All the artwork was produced by John. John's brother Nigel was drafted in to weld up the steelwork that supported the pelmet and the rest of the woodwork was hewn by Damian.

The Okehampton fiddleyard issue was more of a problem but we persisted using the layout in 4-board format for at least one more exhibition. Finally though we admitted defeat and decided that the best solution was to add a fifth scenic board at the Okehampton end of the layout to complete the station loop on-scene and take a single track into the fiddleyard. This board completed the second half of the station road bridge, included a pair of LSWR workers cottages, a stream and a mill building (based on a prototype between Launceston and Egloskerry).

The second extension was more involved than the first, as it required us to lengthen the backscene, lighting pelmet and the display boards. Operationally, though, it was a massive improvement, running was a lot more balanced between the two fiddleyards and using the Okehampton cassettes was easier. In a break between shows John took the plain white MDF backscene sheets away and hand-painted a superb 7m (24') long North Cornwall scene including distant moors and a sighting of the Atlantic coast near the viaduct.

At this point we also had offers of help from other Stafford club members which we gratefully accepted. Fred Shilton offered to build us two outer home signals, the one at the Padstow end being an excellent double-acting tall lattice post example to give sighting over the bridge. Andy Banks made the mill building on the second extension which shielded the entry to the fiddleyard.

Up to now, with all the turnouts being on one board, operation was mechanical and linked to a GEM lever frame. The fifth board made this difficult and so Damian installed Tortoise slow acting point motors instead. The Macclesfield show generated our one and only track failure, a point blade came loose from a tiebar. We never had other track issues and the electrics have always worked faultlessly - both testament to John and Damian's work. After this we steadily added detail to the layout and more appropriate stock to the roster, with Chris getting carried away buying Bulleids, as we attended 4-6 shows a year.

#### **Amendments**

The only major change after this was to change from a cassette fiddleyard system to train turntables. We did this because:

- We wanted to run longer trains than the existing 1200mm fiddles would allow.
- Fuel, van and accommodation price increases meant exhibition organisers didn't want to pay for 5 operators and two vehicles, so we needed fewer operators.
- Handling the cassettes over a long 2-3 day show was becoming quite tedious. The new 1800mm (6') long train turntables enabled us to run five coach trains with ease and almost completely did way with stock handling. In combination to relocating the control panel to the Okehampton end, they meant we only needed three operators (two on, one off) all of whom fitted in the van. Costs and operator workload were reduced. It's something in hindsight we should have done

Sadly though all good things come to an end. Exhibition invites dried up, we'd done just about all those we wanted to do, and

much sooner.



An element of the layout that generated a lot of 'how did you make that' questions at shows were the cutting rock faces. To make these Chris used nothing more than kitchen foil and Artex / plaster. To start a long length of foil was folded in half to give a double thickness, this was then screwed up into a loose ball. The ball was carefully re-opened up into a roughly straight but heavily crinkled sheet. Adjustments were made to the foil crinkles to introduce layers and strata. Once satisfied with the shape. the crinkled foil was used as a mould into

which a sloppy mix of Artex was poured to a depth of around 10-15mm. Once dried, the foil was teased away from the Artex revealing a rock face. This was then fixed into the cutting with more dabs of Artex and painted by John painted by John using a technique of layered acrylic washes on the surface, each mixed with plenty of water and left to dry overnight. After building up the colours, varnish was carefully added to represent water running down the stone and collecting in the cess.

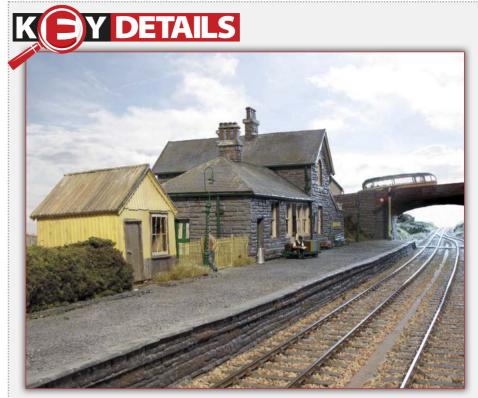
some twice. Increasing work pressures made it difficult to commit to shows and booking Fridays off. We also started working on our own layout ideas: Diesels in the Duchy for Damian and a Wild West layout for John. We also became part of the team that built the Black Country Blues project layout in 2013 for BRM. Treneglos sat gathering dust in Chris's attic and, whilst we didn't want to scrap the layout, it was clear we'd all moved on. Salvation came from a reply to a post made on the RMweb Treneglos thread and in January 2018 the layout was sold and moved down to the South East with its new owner. We hope that the layout brings him as much joy and as many happy memories as it has given us.

Finally, a big thank you to everyone that has contributed or helped operate the layout over the years and, of course, to our respected significant others for putting up with our little NCR obsession.

## What we think...

Whilst still living in France and a committee member of our local model railway club, TGV 086, I recall extending the invitation to the team of 'Treneglos' to bring the layout across the channel for the re-birth of the club's model railway exhibition - RailModels 2008. From a point of view of variety, it was the sole British layout at the exhibition, and went down well with the visitors to the show in Châtellerault.

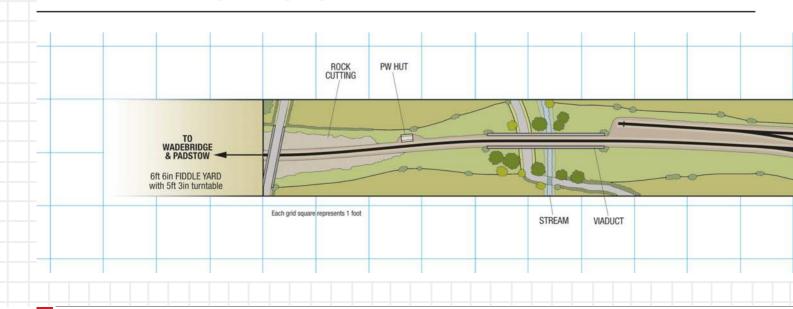


An element that adds to the character of the railways of 'the Withered Arm' is the ballast which originates from the local quarry at Meldon, near Okehampton. When freshly quarried it is generally grey, but weathers to a lighter buff colour, with highlights of yellows and greys. John studied photographs from the early 1960s taken by Peter Gray and did his own field studies, before producing a 'Meldon

mix' of ballast from Woodland Scenics and Javis products. After painting the rails and the sleepers, the mix was applied carefully to the track hand-built by John and Damian, to recreate our version of the permanent way of North Cornwall. Finally, the sleepers were weathered back to represent wood exposed to the elements on the edge of Bodmin Moor!

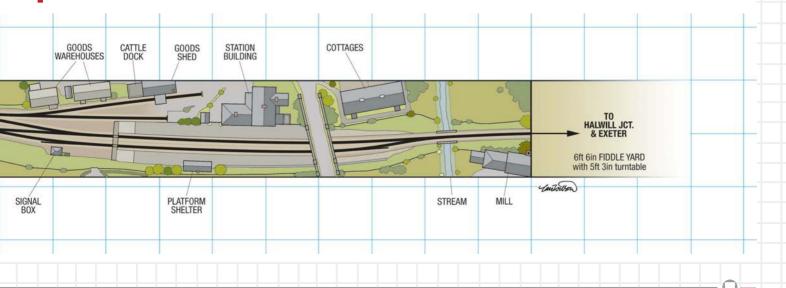


## Meet the modellers...

'Treneglos' was built by three friends - Chris, Damian and John - who, at the time, were all members of Stafford Railway Circle. We'd previously worked together with others on various club projects as diverse as 'New Haden Colliery', an EM gauge layout based on a real North Staffordshire coal mine, through to a light-hearted 'Thomas the Tank Engine' themed layout built to entertain children at the Club's annual show.

Between us our railway interests cover a range of periods, themes and continents: American Wildwest, LNWR, LYR, LSWR, LNER, Lynton & Barnstaple, Somerset & Dorset, Scottish and Cornish diesels. After building Treneglos, Damian went on to build 'Diesels in the Duchy' (an EM diesel depot based on St Blazey) and John started his 'Once Upon a Time... in the West' (Sante Fe in New Mexico project. We were all part of the larger group that built the BRM Project Layout 'Black Country Blues' in 2013/14.

Chris is currently building a 7mm layout 'Pencarrow' based on Bodmin North in Cornwall, Damian is building a cameo of Inverness diesel depot in P4 and John another cameo of a railway under construction 'The Contract'.





# TEA BREAK

The nation's favourite beverage became the focal point of Jeremy and Claudia Everett's diorama. A gathering of locomotive crew drinking tea at the end of a hard-working day.

o much effort is made by modellers to get the moving parts of their railway correct and operating properly, but often there's only a token presence of figures. Railways are about people, the movement of passengers or the movement of goods to be used by people. There is a large range of figures in virtually all scales, from Victorian through to the present day.

With the advent of 3D printing, there's now an even bigger range of figures available from suppliers such as ModelU. These are superb miniatures of real people in realistic poses in any scale you choose. Even larger scales are available to order. When everything is operating smoothly, why not create small but interesting cameos, dioramas or vignettes around your layout?

I have been an artist for many years and one day my partner asked me to paint some figures that he hadn't used on his O gauge layout. Cameos like this aren't difficult to achieve. Figures remain relatively cheap if you're prepared to paint them yourself. Our cameo for BRM is O gauge but could easily be done in OO or N. The figures are in static

poses as they must be on a moving railway. Figures playing football or in running or active poses for example should be avoided.

We purchased five ModelU figures, all but one drinking tea. Three painters and a tramp from S&D Models together with a couple of step ladders and buckets. Some '50s chairs and a small table from Petite Properties. These were actually 1:48 scale, but they work for this scene. My partner needed the guttering and the door for the hut and these were bought from Invertrain.

Posing figures is left to the imagination and I left that to my partner. The painting methods apply to all scales, but don't overdo the shading and highlighting on the smaller scales like OO and N as it won't look right.



For this project I bought four figures and accessories from S&D Models – a Bearded tramp, Painters/Decorators, a pair of floor standing buckets, hanging buckets, a wooden step ladder kit and oddments. Five figures were sourced from ModelU and finally, a set of table and chairs from Petite Properties.

The figures have been cleaned of moulding imperfections. We carefully removed the resin feeds keeping only those attached to the feet. This enables us to hold the figures more easily. The stripped-down figures can then be washed and primed with a spray primer.



Starting with the base colour again, we add a little white to emphasise the high points. We try to complete stages of painting on as many figures as possible at a time.



Facial and clothing details can add much to the finish of the figure. This painter is working outdoors so may have some blushing in his cheeks and/or some spots of paint on his clothes.



When the painting is complete and dry we will use Vallejo colour washes, black and umber, to get a bit of grime on the clothing. Then, after 24 hours, we will varnish the completed figures with Tamiya matt varnish.



We use Plaka, a fast-drying paint, and a ready supply of clean water to dilute them. For the first layer of colour, establish your base colour. The consistency of the paint must be thick enough to cover the primer but liquid enough so as not to fill detail. A sable brush number 00 is recommended.



We are mixing flesh colour with red, yellow or brown, according to the skin tone we want to obtain for the figure. Then, with a 0000 pure sable brush we add the last details, like – small lines, eyes details or buttons. A steady hand is a necessity.



Choosing good mouldings is very important. This tramp is an excellent pewter figure and will result in a very realistic model. We research details like the Harrod's emblem on his bag.



Using a 00 pure sable brush we add a very fluid paint in the same colour as the first layer but a tone darker, to emphasise the shadowy areas, such as creases in clothing. For this, we mix the original colour with a bit of black. In the difficult areas, we use Windsor & Newton Artists' Acrylic Slow Drying Medium, to have time to



Always work only when the previous layer of colour is perfectly dry. We sometimes use a hair dryer to speed things along a bit. Clothes can then be weathered according to the scene.



Colours should be realistic. Try them on a piece of paper and let them dry if you are unsure how they'll look. We rarely use paint directly from the pot. With the exception of blacks, greys and whites, most colours as supplied are too garish.

the first step in creating a cameo, vignette or diorama for your model railway is to imagine the finished project

#### **PRACTICAL BRM**



Building a diorama or cameo doesn't need to be expensive. We simply browsed through all those bits and pieces that we kept tucked away 'just in case'. As we have been modelling since 1985, we have accumulated vast quantities of spare materials, which we can now use now for windows, doors, roofing and a few other elements. Coffee stirrers, for example, make, very realistic planks in most scales with a little work.



The 3mm MDF carcass has had the stirrers, door and windows glued in place. Note the different shades of wood. Tiny gaps are filled with Polyfilla.



Corrugated sheet roofing has been added after grey priming. Resin gutter, plastic window and metal downpipe are also added.



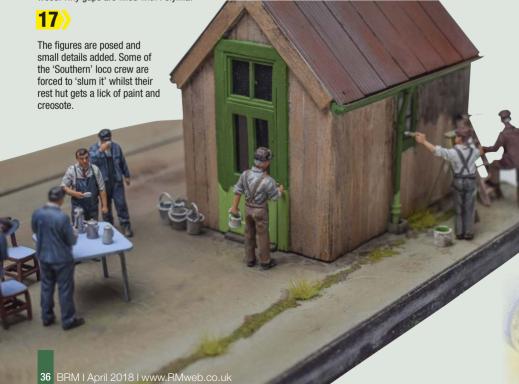
Here three pieces of 6mm pre-shaped MDF (obtainable at any builder's merchant) are glued together leaving a gap for a piece of track - in this case Peco 7mm. Cut strips of floor tiles can be used to cover the whole surface including the gap in the tracks and allow, when appropriately painted, the tiniest of contour to the 'concrete'.



Some 'undercoat' 9 is added to the door. The timbers have now had an Ultimate 'Earth' wash to age them a bit.

#### Top tip

Sable brushes are best for figure painting. If allowed to deteriorate, they can't be used. To prevent this, I clean them with shampoo and then rinse them using hair conditioner. It is handy to have a Windsor & Newton No. 5 water colour brush for applying the washes in one go. I also use Daler Rowney Filbert No. 2 to rapidly emphasise fine details or light on objects. To do this, I dry brush the figures softly until I get the desired effect.

#### **DITCH THE SHED?**

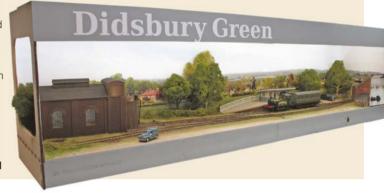

#### KINGS CROSS IN GERMANY

A few years have passed since my previous layout, Chipping Cleghorn appeared in **BRM** magazine. Meanwhile, we have moved house and refurbished it. I also started a new large layout from scratch. The aim was to fulfil my long-term dream of building a freelance model of Kings Cross station. Free-lance because some compression was needed. L also wanted a large six-road engine shed to cater for my collection of mainly ex-LNER and ex-Southern steam locomotives. Last, but not



least, I wanted to incorporate my village of Chipping Cleghorn again. Quite ambitious but I do have a large room at my disposal which is aptly called the Signal Box by my wife.

The station consists of a model of Kings Cross shed with five platforms and 10 tracks. The shed measures 120x70cm. The station is scratch-built, based on internet research and two visits. All the main structures were drawn on the computer first and then laser-cut and clad with Slaters Plastikard. The roof trusses were also laser-cut. The acetate panels were cut by hand and lined with over a thousand Evergreen strips! Tracks 0 and 9 are outside the shed. Over the station throat is a gantry with working light signals, controlled by a decoder. If I set the road for a particular platform, the corresponding signal

changes to green. The station throat is modelled as close as possible after the prototype, taking into account some compression. In between is a scratch-built model of the old Kings Cross signal box, completely made from photographs available on the internet. The layout is still very much a work in progress. I am currently working on the backscene of Kings Cross, building retaining walls and houses from Metcalfe and Scalescenes kits. This layout will give me another few years of building pleasure!

### SCRATCH-BUILD PLASTIC COTTAGES

With modelling inspiration practically on his doorstep, Tony Wright describes how he scratch-built a pair of local buildings.

Yee always advocated modelling an actual prototype. For one, all the principal decisions are made for you. How big should a station be? What is the track layout? What are the non-railway buildings like...? It's with reference to the latter that this piece is concerned. In this respect, modelling real buildings requires, perhaps, a greater 'discipline' than is needed for structures that are just made up, although they might follow regional styles.

My model of 'Little Bytham' is definitely prototype-based and has been created largely by the process of bartering. By that I mean I've built locomotives, painted backscenes and taken photographs in exchange for others making things for me, such as baseboards, trackwork, signals, structures and freight stock. It's worked very well, and it's rather good to have the work of many friends on my layout. However, one of my resolutions this year is to be more self-reliant in my own modelling. With most of the structures on Little Bytham built by Ian

Wilson, Bob Dawson and Scott Waterfield, what was left to make was a trio of dormer cottages situated at the south end of Station Road. I photographed these and scaled them. The following pictures show how I got on building the first two of these cottages.



Little Bytham is in limestone country, so these cottages were made of the local material. Wills coarse stone was a reasonable representation. A strong knife and coarse file were the principal tools used.

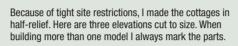
This is the pair of photographic mock-ups. The current windows are made of UPVC, and some of the apertures appear to have been altered down the years. Since I have no pictures of these cottages from 60 years ago, I chose what I thought would be the most appropriate of the Wills range of windows.

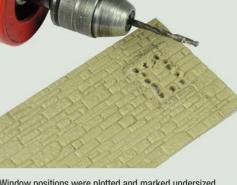
The sheets weren't big enough to make whole length sides, so were joined together with Mek Pak. The sides were then cut to length, ensuring a right angle by

using an engineer's small square, a pencil being used to mark the sheets.



I always use a new blade in the Stanley knife for any work like this. Any cutting was achieved against a safety rule. Using an ordinary rule, one slip and all your lovely work will be covered in blood!





Window positions were plotted and marked undersized using a soft pencil. The dimensions were taken from pictures and the size of the Wills windows. A series of holes were then drilled using a suitable-sized bit in a mini drill, well inside the pencil lines.



The holes were then joined up using the Stanley knife, cutting through from both sides, and pared to near the right size using the Stanley knife. This procedure should always be done by cutting away from your fingers. A slightly less-coarse file was then used to open out the reveals to the right size.

The corners were mitred to give a neat appearance, though some filler was necessary in places. The window frames were fixed with Mek Pak at this stage.

To support the corners, plastic off-cut gussets were glued in place. Where butt-joints were necessary, a strengthening piece was also glued in place. Some of the Wills windows weren't entirely appropriate, so I used some from Jerry Freestone's printed window range. All glazing was fixed with Mek Pak.



With the pantile roof fixed, chimney stacks were added. These came from the Dornaplas range, only three sides being necessary. Chimney pots came from the Dart Castings' range, superglued in place.

All the 'pots in place. The old, distant views showed three chimney stacks, so that's what I made. The 'stone' lintels were cut from the tops of the Wills window frames. The window sills were cut from plastic strip.



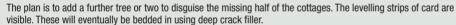
Both part-built cottages were placed *in situ* to see how they'd fit – and they did.



d gueet in prace after he glazing was fixed and curtains 'painted' on the insides. Barge boards were made from plastic strip. I made a start on weathering the roofs at this stage.









As on the prototype, there is a slight gradient on Station Road. The cottages are level, so the 'foundations' were laid using strips of stout card. A spirit level ensured a non-leaning pair of cottages.

Seen from the west side of the railway, I'm delighted how these cottages look. The half-relief is nowhere near as evident in this shot. Ian Wilson's stationmaster's house is to the left. Various little structures came from Harburn Hobbies, Wills, Scenic Route Models or were scratchbuilt. The total cost for all materials came out at £25.00 – £30.00, but much is left over for future projects.





Special entry

We couldn't let the Cakebox Challenge go by without letting our star contributor, Michael Russell, try his hand. This wintery, and delightfully barren diorama plays a couple of tricks with perspective - the front rail is 00, the rear is N and the fauna is in layers and reduces in scale towards the back. Michael may yet roll a locomotive into the scene too, but he has prepared a tutorial about its construction for a future edition in the meantime. The only name he could think of was 'View Across the Tracks', which, while not setting the world alight, describes exactly what's going on in the model. Here's a brief preview of it, then.

in place until the glue had set. Initial checks were made for the 'look' of the finished items - and minor mods were made before construction was too advanced. The scenery was constructed using standard methods - mod-roc and flock. The sand was simulated using a material designed for use to create mortar for dolls houses

secured to the board with PVA. Due to the tight curve on the upper track it was pinned

A key feature is the steam shovel. This is a plastic kit of an Erie shovel, made by Highway Miniatures. The buffers are Peco items to which I added lamps with LEDs linked to the power in the respective tracks.

The shed is a cut down laser cut item from Ancorton. The figures are a mixture of Dapol and white metal castings. To add operational interest I have a removable fiddlestick - which is beyond the challenge dimensions - which allows the lower train to shunt off the layout. Power can be provided from my trusty Hornby controller - which can be plugged in to a connection point under the layout.

### WINSOR HILL

The Somerset & Dorset line has inspired many layouts. Paul Stephens is likewise enthused by the Mendips scenery, but has chosen to model a slightly unusual section.

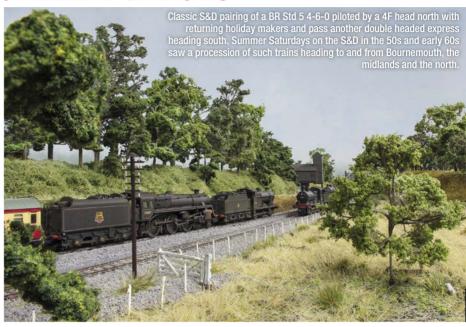
ew of those who witnessed the passing of the last passenger trains on the Somerset & Dorset Railway 52 years ago in March 1966 could have imagined that more than half a century later the line would still be held in such devoted affection, and mainly now by people who would have had no first-hand experience of the line. Not surprisingly the interest has also resulted in a great deal of model railway layouts that continue to appear with great regularity.

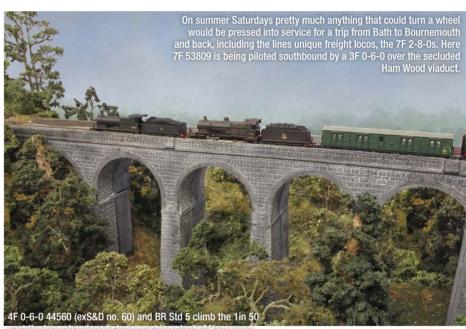
My model of Midsomer Norton Station first appeared in the model railway press over eight years ago. In more recent times I have been building more scenes from my beloved S & D, including Bath bank and the entrance to Devonshire tunnel, a section of Lyncombe Vale and the northern portal of Combe Down tunnel, the southern end of Chilcompton tunnel and, in particular, the fascinating section of the S & D that passes Winsor Hill tunnels and quarry sidings before crossing the beautiful and secluded Hamwood viaduct. Readers will note a theme developing here, I like tunnels!

As the S & D climbed into the Mendip Hills north of the Radstock/Midsomer Norton area, the collieries gave way to the second major freight revenue for the railway - quarries, with their associated and, it must be confessed, rather ugly stone crushing plants. The stretch modelled was typical of the line on the southern slopes of the Mendips and for the S & D connoisseur there was plenty to enjoy at Winsor Hill. There were two single track tunnels, the first dating from the opening of the line in 1874, the second added in 1892 when the Midford to Templecombe section of the line was doubled.

A most unusual signal box was located between the two running lines, the only one on the line built entirely of stone controlling the sidings on each side of the running lines. Those on the up side served Hamwood quarry whilst those on the downside, Winsor Hill quarry. A little further north the line crossed Ham Wood viaduct over a deeply wooded ravine. The nearest road was several miles away, and was just the place to watch and listen to trains travelling the long stretch of 1 in 50 in a northerly direction.

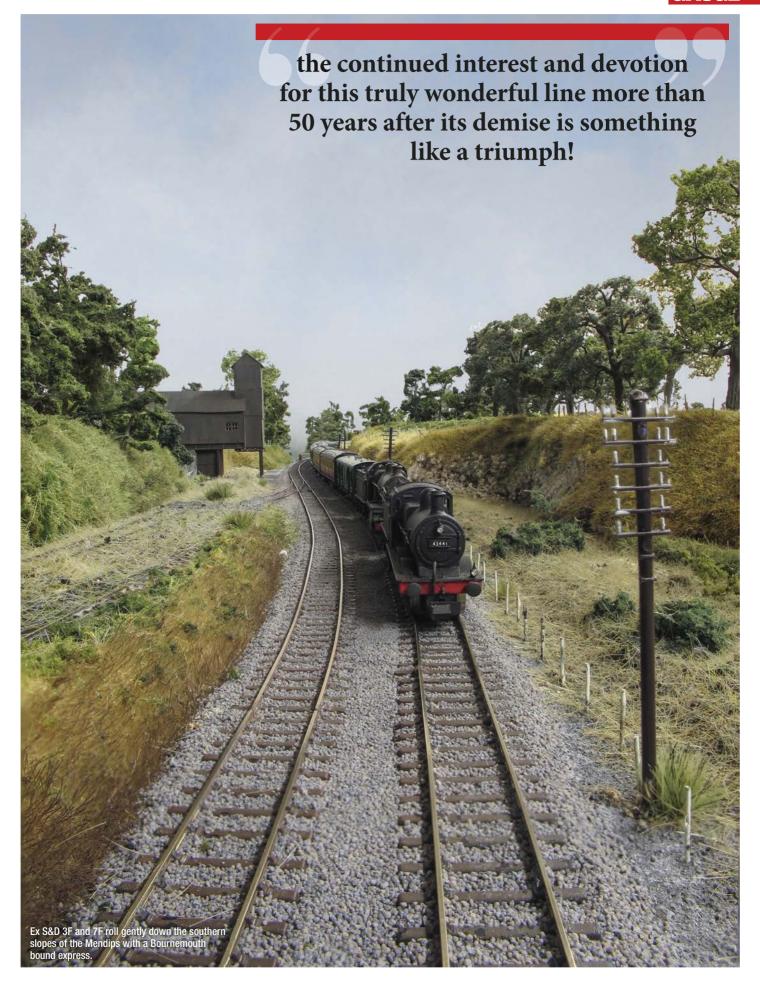
The period for my model is the mid-1950s some ten years after the quarries had closed. The signal box is no longer in use, although the Ham Wood sidings remained in situ, albeit becoming increasingly overgrown, until the S & D closed in 1966. Winsor Hill sidings on the down side were removed in



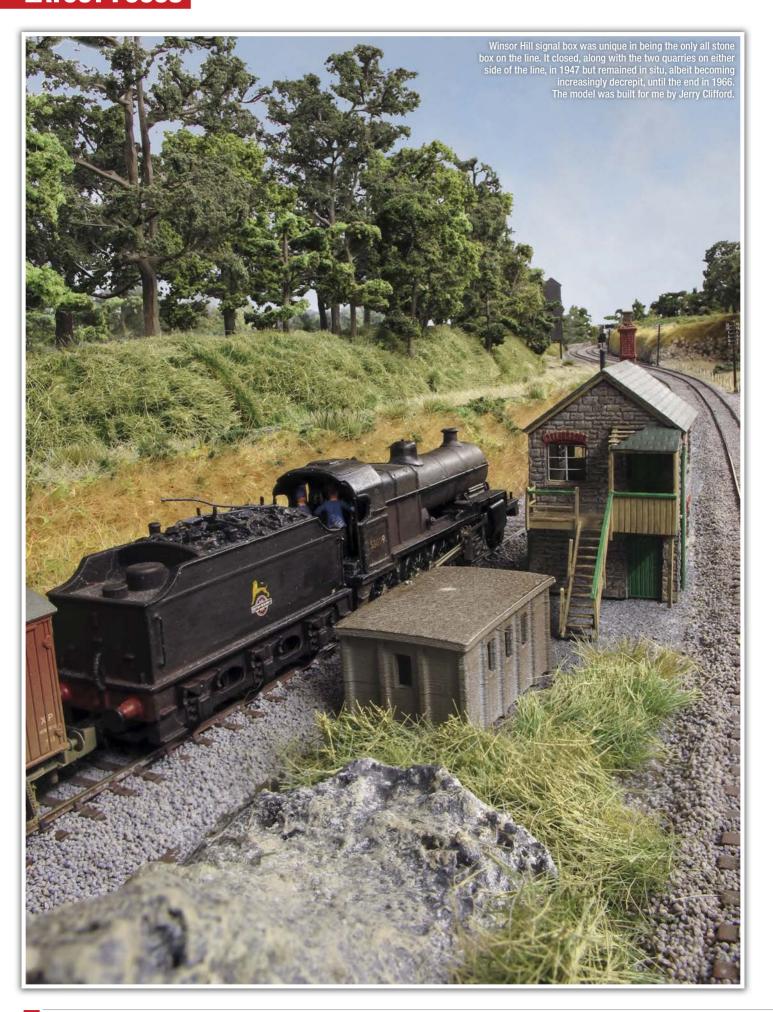


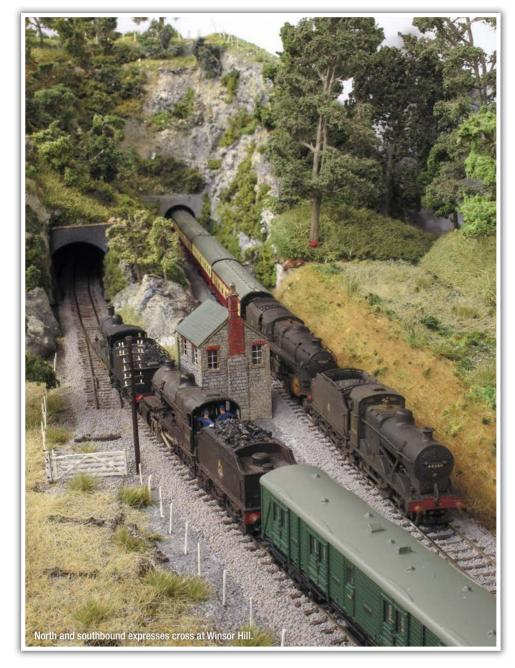


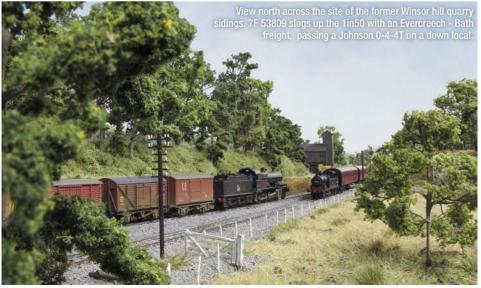

the early 1950s. The trackbed, viaduct and tunnels can still be walked, offering some stunning views out over the Mendip hills. Concrete pads can still be seen inside the original, longer tunnel, evidence of its use for testing aero engines following closure of the line.

#### The choice of N gauge

Like anyone living in a very average threebed semi, the reasons for choosing N gauge are clear enough. How else can you run double headed 12 coach trains in typical Mendip scenery? Were I to replicate the same scene in 4mm scale a room measuring 26' x 18' would be required!

#### **Trackwork**

Having made two great friends in the 2mm Scale Association in the last 20 years, namely John Greenwood and Jerry Clifford, I have come into close proximity to the much more attractive 2mm Finescale trackwork. I therefore decided to ask Jerry to lay the track at Winsor Hill. The plain track is the Finetrax plastic sleeper-based system with code 40 bullhead rail. The points are PCB sleepers with code 40 rail soldered in place using components from the 2mm Scale Association. The overgrown trackwork in the quarry sidings is Peco and is actually laid at an incline of 1 in 50. On the prototype the sidings are level but the mainline is climbing steadily. This wasn't possible on the model, but this visual trick works surprisingly well at giving the impression of a steeply inclined line.

#### **Buildings** etc

Jerry Clifford also built the signal box using embossed plastic card, whilst John Greenwood has scratch-built a number of super locomotives for me, including a large boilered 7F 2-8-0, a Johnson 1P 0-4-4T and 2P 4-4-0s.

Everything else on the layout was my own work. Ham Wood Viaduct is a heavily adapted Faller HO single track stone kit, which was split down the middle and extended for double track. This was done in brick, typical of viaducts on the northern extension of the S&D which were originally built, in stone to accommodate single track. When the line was doubled in the 1890s the new bits were invariably in brick. The stone crushing plant was built of plastic card and expertly weathered by Jerry. The tunnel mouths are also in plastic. The original tunnel has an unpretentious, brick portal set into the rock cutting and the later second

bore has a tunnel mouth made by modifying a suitable Z gauge viaduct arch.

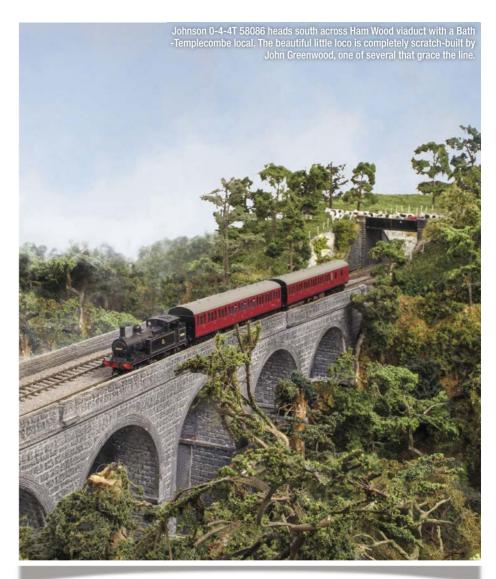
#### Scenery

For basic scenery I always use polystyrene blocks stuck together with PVA glue and carved with a bread knife –a fine mess, guaranteed. These are then coated in filler, which has large amounts of PVA included to give a tough skin. Rock faces and strata are carved into the filler before the lot is sprayed with grey car primer to seal it ready for further colouring and detailing. Once painted ground cover is built up from the usual sources of flock, such as Woodland scenics, although a great deal of use is made of the long grass matting available from Heki and Gaugemaster.

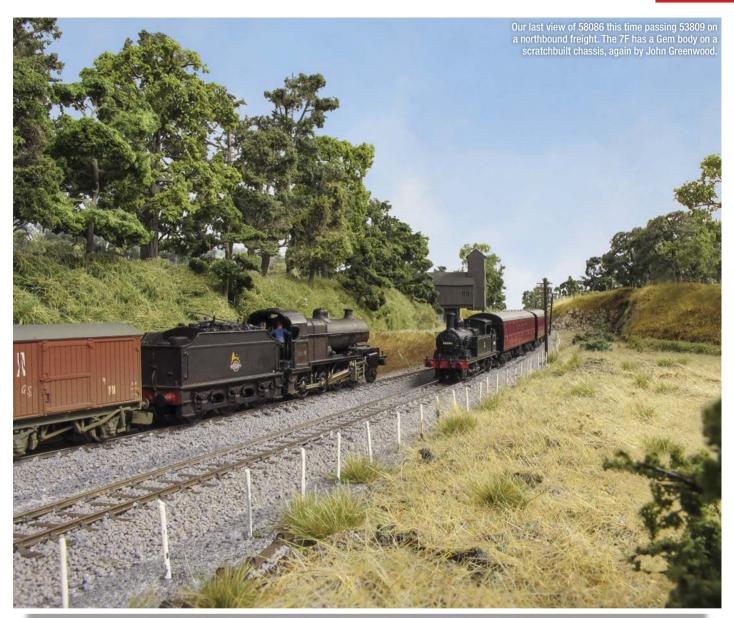
The tunnel section has of course to be accessible for track maintenance so the polystyrene blocks here are arranged so they can be easily lifted out of the way. The trees are a mixture of hand-made and the superb examples available from the 4D Model shop in London.

#### Conclusion

I am very pleased with the finished model. It is perhaps not the most usual S & D location but is one that typifies the Mendip section of the line. Alas, the sight of steam has vanished like the mists around Valhalla, but the continued interest and devotion for this truly wonderful line more than 50 years after its demise is something like a triumph! ■







#### What we think.

I am a big fan of N layouts. The diminutive scale obviously allows more space for modelling, but I'm still impressed with the amount of scenery and variety that Paul has



managed to fit in here - the tunnels are a great feature and I'm always a sucker for a big bridge. Winsor Hill is just one part of a much larger layout, so I'm looking forward to seeing what else he has in store. Andy McVittie, Editor



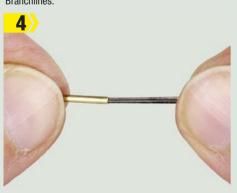


## ADD SUSPENSION AND FLYWHEELS

Fitting a flywheel



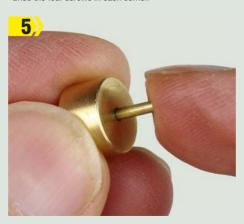
I used a piece of brass tube from Hobby Holidays with an outside diameter of 1.5mm and an internal diameter of 1mm, and a 10mm diameter brass flywheel from Branchlines.



Use a round file or a tapered reamer to clean out any burr on the inside of the tube.



Pull out the coupling from either end of the locomotive and undo the four screws in each corner.



Slide the flywheel onto the tube – you should find that it is an interference fit.



Use a razor saw and a mitre box to cut a 6mm long piece of tubing. Tidy up the cut end with a file.



Now slide the flywheel into place on the motor shaft and use a drop of Loctite or superglue to hold it in place. Get the flywheel as close to the end of the motor as you can without fouling wiring. Test the locomotive with the body off and, if all is well, reassemble.



In the second of a three-part series, Michael Russell explains how compensation and momentum can enhance the running of your locomotives.

ne of the best ways to avoid stalls, no matter what the condition of the track, is to fit compensation. This is complicated to fit retrospectively, although even adding springing to a single wheelset will make a dramatic improvement. Few tools and parts are required, however.

It is very important at the outset that I make clear that you should not try to add suspension to any axle that is geared to the motor, as you must not disrupt the gap between the worm and gear. On most locomotives this will be obvious, but with others it is not so clear. DJ Models' 0-6-0ST 'Austerity' for example, has gears on all its coupled axles so you can't make adjustments of this nature.

Flywheels are another great asset to locomotive performance and aren't difficult to fit if there's space. Motors with doubleended shafts are a rare fitment in ready-torun models unfortunately, but one obvious example is Golden Valley Hobbies' 'Janus' 0-6-0 diesel shunter, as used here.

#### **Adding Suspension**



The Bachmann 03 diesel only needs the couplings and four screws to be removed in order to release the baseplate. The lack of wires to the pickups makes the job much easier.



The leading axle isn't geared and the coupling rod pivots because it is made of two pieces joined at the centre

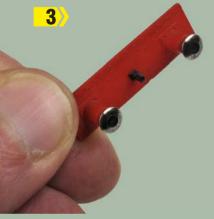
driver - an ideal arrangement for our purposes.



Drill two holes to hold the springs directly below the front axle. Space them equidistantly. The hole depth needs to be about half the length of the spring and you can mark the drill bit with some tape to indicate this. Ensure the chassis has enough depth to accommodate the holes.

#### Note

On my model there was much more play in the rear motor bearing than in the front bearing, which caused the flywheel to oscillate more than I would like. This is fine as long as you keep the model to a low speed, as the prototype would have been operated. If you have DCC operation I would suggest that you set a low top speed using CV 5 or a suitable speed table.



I obtained two small springs from the buffers of an old Hornby/Dapol austerity tank. Be very careful, as it is easy to lose small springs. You can purchase suitable springs or you may have some left over from a previous job.



Undo the screws holding the engine jack drive connections in place and lift the wheels away.

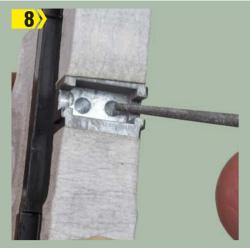


Cover the motor and gear space with masking tape to prevent any ingress of foreign matter.



Measure the diameter of your springs and choose a drill that is slightly larger. My springs were 1.85mm in diameter, so I chose a 2mm drill

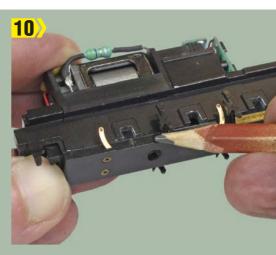

Using a fine round file, slightly indent the axle bearing surfaces. You only want to remove a little material. Make sure you remove the same amount on each side.



Carefully clear away all swarf left over from drilling and filling using a hog's hair brush. Remove the masking



Using the same file, remove a small amount from the baseplate where it holds the front axle. Mark the filling points using a pencil beforehand by holding the baseplate in position over the chassis.



Temporarily refit the wheels and baseplate and ensure that you are happy with the play in the front wheels – you only want a millimetre or so of movement.



Make a small pressure plate from phosphor bronze (brass will suffice too) that is slightly smaller than the recess in the chassis. This has to move up and down in the recess, so round the corners off with a file and smooth the edges.



Drop the springs into the holes, locate the pressure plate and check that the front wheelset moves up and down freely. Rectify any issues at this stage.



Add a drop of oil to the new pressure plate and reformed bearing surfaces on the chassis.



Now put everything back together, being careful to avoid upsetting the front axle springing arrangement.

#### Conclusion

The suspension has dramatically improved the running of my Class 03 diesel, and I have successfully added suspension to many other small locomotives from several manufacturers. As usual, the precise implementation depends upon the specific locomotive being fitted, but the instructions listed here are as generic as possible and the principles expounded should allow you to achieve success in the vast majority of cases. Next time we'll look at adding pickups to tender locomotives in order to improve current collection.

## A success story: **GRIMY TIMES**

Cheshire-based model shop, Grimy Times, has established a loyal following, with customers seeking its locomotive and rolling stock weathering and detailing services. Owner Steve Johnson, recalls how his business grew to serve the modelling community.



BRM: How did Grimy Times begin life? Grimy Times: I never imagined that one day I would be earning my living from what had been my hobby for many years. As a result of an operation, I was immobile and wanting something to do, so decided to 'play' with the airbrush I had rarely used. I enjoyed it and developed my skills. One thing led to another and soon I was being asked to supply weathered locomotives and weather friends' rolling stock. With imminent changes at work, I decided to take the plunge and make a go of it.

*BRM*: How do you "make a go of it" at the start?

Grimy Times: I was already converting the garage into a layout room, so I accommodated a working space, spray booth and shelving into the design. Growing the business through recommendation of others was good, but getting out there on the exhibition circuit and on the internet was important so others could see the quality of work. This naturally led to the stocking of pre-weathered locomotives for sale.

The mainstay of Grimy Times was the bespoke weathering of customers' locomotives and rolling stock as well as renumbering and identity changes. This side of the business grew at a tremendous rate and space became a real issue. Boxes full of locomotives were arriving daily in addition to customers who were dropping off items at home or at exhibitions. Space was such an issue that the spare bedroom was quickly becoming a storeroom and there was no space to build my layout! I didn't want a lack of space to impede the business

BRM: So, you needed new 'digs'? Grimy Times: Yes, a coincidence of circumstances helped the business move to the next stage. For a number of years, I had sourced new locomotives for customers and the exhibition stand from a long-established model railway shop in Warrington.



The owner let me know that he would be retiring and the shop would close. I knew that there was probably plenty of space upstairs to accommodate a workshop and storage area. I asked the owner if I could visit and realised that with minor modifications, working from there would streamline operations. But, there was the shop to consider.

BRM: What was going through your mind at the time?

#### Grimy Times:

Lots! How would the shop run? What would be stocked? Who would run it? Was it viable? It was going to be a big step! I consulted with close friends and colleagues and we discussed everything. The decision was made - Grimy Times moved into the shop at the end of July 2015.

BRM: What had to be done for the move? Grimy Times: The first thing was to allocate a block of time - you can't weather locomotives whilst setting up a shop. Upstairs, the workshops were fitted out with new lighting, extractor fans and spacious working spaces. Newly-built sturdy shelving in the store room allowed us to efficiently store items and prioritise work. Downstairs, the existing shop stock was packed away. In one week with a strict timetable and budget, the shop was transformed and the retail space doubled. The installation of large display cabinets allowed us to showcase pre-weathered locomotives and a range of shop items.

BRM: How has the shop changed since that first day?

Grimy Times: We've worked hard over the last few years to build up a wide range of stock to cater for railway modellers. Not only do we offer rolling stock and

accessories from the major manufacturers but also an extensive range of detailing parts, kits, glues, paints, plastics and scenic items. We've had to treble the shelving space to accommodate the extra stock we now carry. We've also increased the space of pre-owned items which always proves popular. The customer base has increased tremendously and continues to do so.

BRM: You're still working hard at weathering models...

Grimy Times: It's great - providing people with customised weathering services continues to be at the core of the business, with our existing customer base and new customers coming on-board weekly. The shop has allowed us to expand and provide customers with value-added experiences. The additional space in the workshop has made working more efficient and helped to narrow the turnaround period for weathering too.

BRM: So, no regrets opening a shop because it has worked out well?

Grimy Times: Very well indeed, but it has been hard work to get to the point we are at now. However, we realise that the work isn't over as we constantly strive to meet new and old customers' expectations regarding weathering services or stock in the shop. It has also allowed home life to get back to normal, have the spare bedroom back and get the layout built!

BRM: Thanks for your time Steve, we'll see you at an exhibition soon.





# FROM DERELICIUN TO DOMESTIC BLISS

Dave Rowe has been absent from the scene for years, but he never stopped modelling. Here he describes how he and wife Shirley renovated and then made a stunning replica of a depilated Victorian barn.

phone call came from my daughter. She and her husband thought it time they bought a house. One had come onto the market that they were interested in. Would I carry out a structural survey please? Damp floors, damp walls, a poor quality extension with roof problems, rotted windows etc. We all left in silent gloom.

The next morning brought another phone call. They had found a very different property near Devizes, would I go and look at that one please? The photo on the right shows the sight that greeted me - and I thought the first property had enough defects to rule it out!

A builder converting an adjacent barn said he could do the work. and if we wanted to do some of the easier jobs, that was fine. We started by removing the slates and lifting the damp brick flooring while the builder put in concrete etc. At the end of two months he submitted a horrendous bill for not a lot of work and that not all done properly, so his services were dispensed with. We decided to continue

labouring until another contractor could be found, but soon realised that most of the tasks required toil and common sense, but not much brainpower, so we never contacted another builder.

The local library filled in the gaps in our knowledge, and if we were still in doubt we called in the building inspector who



was always pleased to advise. For the large areas of brickwork and plastering we hired labour as both trades need at least two years of constant practice to produce proficient work and, although we put up the new roof timbers ourselves we employed someone to lay the slates. All the other trades were DIY, including the use of an excavator, which our daughter had to master.

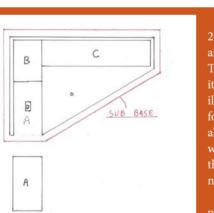
Before work commenced Shirley said, "Oh dear there won't be anything I can do until right at the end when I can tackle the painting." Two years later, she had put up roof timbers, dug drainage trenches by hand, helped install a septic tank, sawn thermal blocks, blasted whitewash off walls with a pressure washer, put up ceilings, installed windows and put in hardwood floors. Good job there wasn't an S.P.C.G.P.A (Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Grannies of Pensionable Age).

There were times when the rain persisted all weekend, as we laboured on in a roofless shell, but at the end of those two years we were super fit and had the satisfaction of building a finished home for their first Christmas. These pleasurable feelings were greatly enhanced by the presence of newborn twins. One of my gifts to the new

parents was a 4mm scale model of the derelict barn as purchased.

The work on their home had been completed the previous summer, so I had plenty of time to make a super detailed model as, fortunately, they had taken many photos. I borrowed these on the pretext of deciding which ones I would like to have copies of. The ploy ensured that the gift would be a complete surprise.

The barn is L-shaped and the model is 270 mm by 380 mm, but to have displayed it on a rectangular base would have meant a large area of rather boring rubble and weeds, so a five-sided configuration was opted for.



...That decision meant having two bases, one upon the other. B and C in this diagram were constructed on a piece of 20mm thick beech, but with the section that would hold a cut away to allow it to be inserted and removed. While this base was kept at 20mm thickness under B and C, the remainder of the wood was given a taper with the aid of a large bandsaw and given uneven contours with a hand belt-sander fitted with a 40 grit belt.

The sub base was of 18mm thick beech, 20mm larger all round than the upper base and with its edge routed to an ogee profile. This lower base had a recess morticed into it D to hold a PP3 9V battery to provide illumination into Section B of the barn, for although the end wall was removable, all those years of dirt and the absence of windows meant that the gloom was such that a torch would have otherwise been necessary to see all the detail.

Section A was modelled with a 6mm plywood floor to which 4mm MDF walls were to be pinned and glued. When these walls were cut out they had brick embossed styrene glued to the inner surfaces using contact adhesive. This adhesive is the most suitable for fixing styrene, but the surfaces must never be brought together until they have been allowed to dry out for some hours. Doing so as soon as they are "touch dry" will result in bubbling of the styrene as the solvent attacks it. I suppose I should have carried out experiments to determine just how long it can be left to dry without



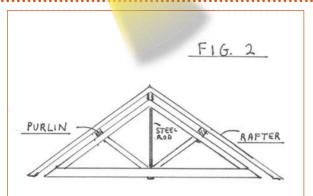
Now, a farmer who is selling a barn in this condition doesn't bother to clean out the many years of junk that had accumulated inside the two storey section. This detritus was part of the decrepitude of the whole building and I wished to have this visible, but how? A removable roof over the two storey section would reveal the first floor rubbish, but leave the ground floors accumulation invisible. The only openings on the ground floor were two small round windows and three doors, only two of which would give any view of the interior. The best solution seem to be that of having the whole single storey wing as a removable section, but this still wouldn't give a view into the first floor unless the whole end wall of the two story part came away. This would be an odd way of working, but I pressed ahead...

losing its adhesive powers, but I did find that leaving it overnight was too long.

All the interior walls had been whitewashed in times past, but with the passing of years they had deteriorated into 50 Shades of Grey. Photos allowed me to capture the real walls in miniature. There were small areas where the whitewash had flaked, revealing the colour of the bricks whilst other random bricks had, for reasons unknown, become almost black and others were green with algae. It takes time to paint individual bricks but, by jingo, it looks so much better if you make the extra effort.

I glued on the styrene for the external wall surfaces and here I should confess to cheating because I used Slaters Flemish Bond, which is incorrect. The real building has 353 mm solid walls laid to a band of alternate rows of headers and stretchers, and I wasn't prepared to scribe thousands of bricks by hand. The 40mm square opening gave a good view of the underside of the roof, so it was necessary to make it

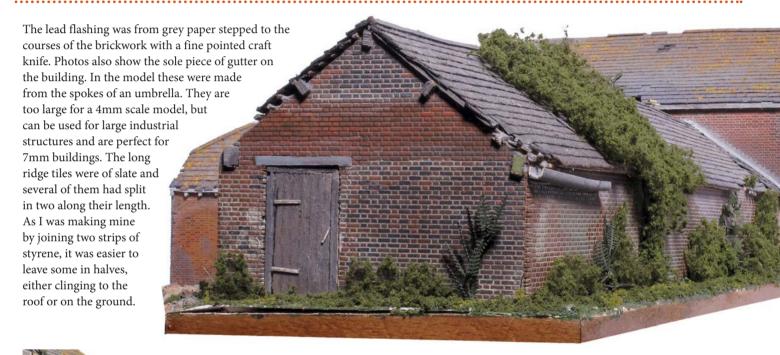


There were two trusses that bore the purlins and the ridge board, and supported the laths to which the slates were nailed. The trusses, purlins and rafters were made from beech cut with a bandsaw, but the laths were cut with a Stanley knife from 0.5 mm plywood. The laths used on this barn 120 years ago were of a heavier cross-section, so they were not too difficult to cut out. The slates were formed from 0.5 mm black styrene sheet, cut out in strips and laid in overlapping staggered rows.

Left of the opening was a small compound formed from a

wooden frame and chain link fencing. It had a lockable door bearing the sign "Danger. Farm chemicals". This, with the installation of a chemical toilet and a curtain pinned around it for privacy, was our only toilet for the first year. The mesh from a kitchen sieve gave an excellent representation of the chain link.

The slates had a prolific growth of orange lichen. Some lichens spread out quite flat, but this orange variety had a depth of growth. I used oil paints to show this, mixing vermilion hue and lemon yellow. These needed to be mixed straight from their tubes and a small stiff bristle brush was used to pick some up, but not enough to form a blob. Oil paint applied in thick spots will, of course, take some time to harden, so no handling until you are sure it's dry.





This image shows a prominent oil drum towards the centre of the weedy, rubble strewn area. There was a real oil drum in this section, but for the model I've used the drum as a push button for the lights.





There were lights downstairs but not upstairs so I've tried to be discrete and hidden the upstairs ones behind trusses.

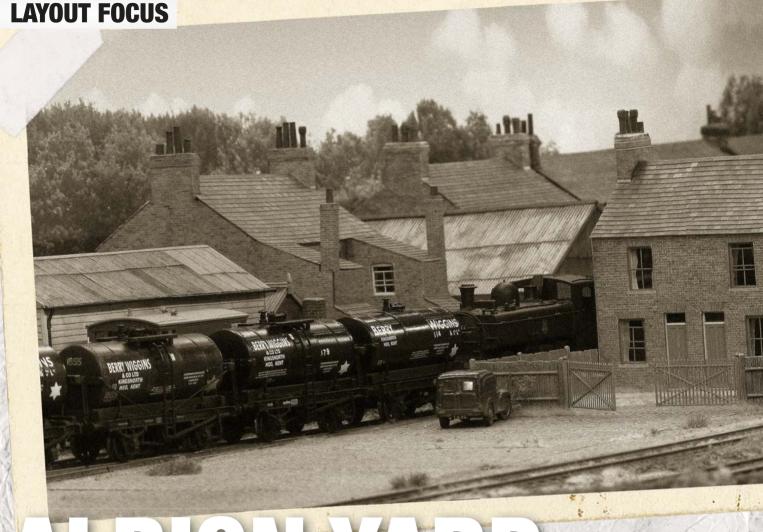

ALBUN YARU

Paul Marshall-Potter's Western Region layout has seen many changes over the years, including a house move, but has remained gorgeous throughout...

lbion Yard has had a varied history. My layout prior to this was in EM gauge and was sold on at the time of a house move. A short while afterwards, and once established in the new home. I decided to build another layout. I wanted a quick route to get something up and running, time being at a premium. Peco had just released its Code 75 three-way point and an Iain Rice plan had grabbed my imagination. It was called 'Cornfield Street' and was based in the east end of London. The plan was followed pretty faithfully, but elements of it weren't working for me. As part of the modifications I added a couple of points to make it operate better, in getting more play value out of it. For speed, simplicity and reliability I chose Peco Code 75 track and Peco point motors. The reliability of them in the fifteen years or so the layout has been in existence has been

exemplary, with no failures of note.

The layout was kept in a modified studio and as we'd downsized to a smaller house, it sat above a pair of tall bookcases. This meant the track bed height was around 55 inches from floor level. This gave a close to eye-line presentation and my subsequent layouts have followed suit, the viewpoint being more realistic. Because the original inner London design hadn't worked for me, the layout spent a good few years being fairly non-descript, and I often used it as a photo set for magazine articles and hobby photography.

#### Waning Interest

After five years I started to lose interest in the layout – it was interesting enough to operate, but there was definitely something missing, and it took a while to find out what that was. I think it was partially caused by the flexibility I'd inadvertently built into the layout. All the structures could be removed and placed in different locations, however getting a really pleasing and plausible overall appearance was eluding me. I could mock up scenes for photography which was interesting and challenging, but they were temporary and the appearance wasn't carried across the layout, just sections of it at a time. The layout had no backscene or fascia and didn't need them, as the layout location was a narrow corridor with white walls and ceiling. The light that bounced around lit the model well, and the white walls gave an infinity view for a back scene. The layout stayed this way until a further house move about five years later.

#### Time for Change

This time we made the move the right way, the result being a larger house and a better home for Albion Yard in a former French polishing studio, which was well lit, well







The Goods office manager checks his timings as Pannier 7781 pauses during shunting the yard. The locomotive origins are a Bachmann DC 57xx pannier. To capture the everyday look, the fire iron hooks are populated with a set of etched fire irons, the rear cab shutter has been opened, the lamp brackets replaced and three link couplings fitted. Note the Fireman's shovel wedged in the handrail, ready to move coal in the bunker. Small details such as these add to a locomotive's personality.



This is part of the view the operator gets looking into the layout. What you see is what you get, and there's no manipulation in terms of added backscenes. The corner of the backscene lies behind the last house and the banner material forms a seamless curve for both viewer and layout operator. The proscenium arches and pelmet constrain any viewer's sightline, so they can't see the edges of the sky. Track is Peco Code 75 and is heavily weeded to give that backwater run-down look. The locomotive and wagons are typical of the forest. The 21T mineral on the left-hand side would be unusual - perhaps the yard manager is wondering why it's on his patch!

This is the sort of image that the layout has been used for. As far as I know 08s didn't work in the Forest of Dean, almost certainly not in the 'blue' era. However, the layout provided opportunities for use as a photo set. When RMweb first started in 2005 it was partly as an idea to get more images onto the web, rather than the hyperlinks often required in Yahoo! groups and other similar media. The layout, with the variations that were possible by moving structures around, was particularly well-suited to act as a photo set and this is typical of the types of images that were produced.





This is an example of how the view-blocking works. Three or four trees are placed at locations on the very foreground of the layout, forcing viewers to look through and around the trees as you would in real life. This technique can also hide entry and exit points on layouts. The brake van is a Southern Railway version and some may think looks a little odd in this context. However, the locomotives and rolling stock are modelled on images—I have of the types working within the Forest of Dean in the late 1950s through to the 1960s.

insulated and secure. This studio interior was also painted white and for the first time I was able to stand back from the layout and see it in its entirety, rather than being constrained by the corridor. I'd accepted an offer to exhibit the layout at the Manchester exhibition in 2011, so the layout needed completing. Going back to Iain Rice designs had inspired me to try something similar. I'd also been impressed with Barry Norman's 'Petherick' layout, which had had a similar constrained viewpoint and semi-theatrical presentation as Iain Rice had been using and designing. I'd been going through various photographic album books, and was struck by the similarity of many of them - very staid photography, lots of platform three-quarter front images, and none of them 'floating my boat' at all.

Being interested in off-the-beaten-track railways, some photographs from these albums started to stand out for me; in particular the work of Ben Ashworth, who has an impressive catalogue of images from Gloucestershire and the Forest of Dean. These particularly captured my imagination and I looked at the layout with a view to making it more prototypical. One thing that stood out was the number of trees and the challenge of making them. I wanted to capture the feel of being in a wooded area, so I started experimenting with deliberately blocking viewpoints with trees and buildings.

#### Room with a view

At this point I had a good idea that I wanted the backscene to complement the model and not overpower it, also that there should be no visible seams in the sky. This meant searching for a suitable material that could be portable for exhibition and not crease or show any joins. Chris Nevard had offered me the use of an image of his which could be digitally printed to get a woodland backdrop. With this in mind I tried to find a suitable material with a degree of strength and thickness that would offer a durable print.

Most commercial printers have a variety of materials they can offer, but it took a while to find what I needed. The first trial was looking at curtain side truck canvasses. These had the strength and rigidity I wanted but, as the cotton used as a strengthening weave showed through, there was an unwanted visible texture. Finally I found a commercial printer that had experience of printing theatrical back drops, so immediately understood what I wanted and needed. He was able to supply an opaque matt banner material and spent time doing test prints. We achieved the correct

This view looks into the fiddle yard and has changed significantly. Whilst the overall composition was pleasing and allowing for the fact the large warehouses are 'off stage' the view was unbalanced and dominated by the large structures, Online I found a set of houses built from the same Howard scenic kits as the other structures, so I purchased them substituting them for the warehouses. The right-hand foreground low warehouses also didn't 'hang' well. Nothing wrong with them, but I knew I could find something better, so they were replaced with workers cottages. If you compare this image to the leading image, you can see the dramatic change, al part of the layout's evolution.

colour balance by taking a small diorama section of scenery made to the same colours as the layout to the printer and checking the test prints against the diorama. Once the backscene was printed and hung on the layout, any alterations and additions have subsequently been tried and tested with the layout lighting to maintain consistency.

#### **Control Interchangeability**

The layout was built for DC operation and to operate as a one engine in steam branch line. This means that because there was only ever one locomotive to operate at a time, all track sections are live, though there are a few isolating sections, for play value. When I tried DCC out, all rail sections were live, so it was a simple case of adding an NCE controller socket to the track feed to allow DCC operation. At some exhibitions I've run DC one day, DCC the next with sound-fitted GWR 57XX 0-6-0 'Panniers'. A DC controller failed at one show, and the ability to swap in a matter of minutes to DCC was useful. In the event of DCC failure, I can easily swap back to DC.



#### No Distractions

From the outset the layout had been designed to be operated from the front and I wanted the operator as well as the public to get the impact of the print, and overall appearance. I've kept the presentation to a letter box shape, which keeps the viewer's eye on the modelled area. I only have the layout name on the fascia, with no other distracting information. Lighting is from a fluorescent strip behind the fascia panel, the wrap round back scene bounces light back into the viewing area giving a bright overcast weather feel to the display.

## Meet the modeller...

My background in the hobby is from childhood and my late father's influence. We always had a model railway, which he'd built, and after he passed on I've built my own. On leaving school I spent five years in one of the best shops in the country, selling models and running its mail order department. I've built layouts in N, OO and EM, and collaborated on various friends' projects across the three major scales of 2mm:1ft, 4mm:1ft and 7mm:1ft. My interests are primarily branch and industrial lines rather than mainline railways, and most of my layouts and models reflect this.





7781 appears again, hogging the limelight! This engine raises questions at shows for two reasons. Firstly, it's DCC sound fitted using one of the first South West Digital chips, so is very much a version 1 release. The speaker is hidden within the bunker, with the chuff rate synchronised to wheel revolution, and volume is discrete so that it sounds and looks nice. Secondly, I get asked why a Great Western (GWR) Livery so late, roughly ten years after nationalisation. Well 7781, was one of the few locomotives that retained its GWR colours well into the late 1950's, possibly as far as the 1960's as some did. There are images of this engine within the Forest of Dean, so to do something a bit different amongst the fleet of black panniers, I rung the changes and modelled a Great Western livery.





# **OO**GAUGE

#### Studying images

Getting the railway equipment looking 'right' started my association with Pannier Tanks and Western Region locomotives and stock that operated around the Forest of Dean.

As I tightened the criteria of how and what

I'd include on the model, I found that the process was becoming more enjoyable and 'life' was coming back into the layout. Part of that was the discipline of weeding out what was needed in terms of rolling stock and locomotives. Using Ben Ashworth's images, I



Fittingly, as we come towards a close, we see the face of the new generation of motive power. Here is a Class 14 'Teddy bear', which would have been one of the natural successors to the Western Region Pannier fleet. There was a problem as these useful machines came on line, however, as the very work that had been anticipated for them was rapidly drying up, so they had a pretty short life under British Rail. They were recognised as a good design and many lived on in industrial use with such organisations as the National Coal Board, a number of these working at Ashington in Northumbria, well away from their western roots!

chose specific locomotives to model, copying the detail variations. I found myself with a familiar locomotive at one point – a real deja-vu moment – as I realised that I'd made the same locomotive twice! At some point the locomotive had a major overhaul and the boiler and tank details had been swapped. I got around this by digging through my reference images to find a suitable locomotive with the right details, and changed the number to suit.

#### Traffic flows

I looked at specific traffic flows through the forest, and two types were well known and illustrated. Coal from the Forest of Dean coalfield was the most prevalent traffic. The majority of coal traffic was carried in either 16 ton steel mineral wagons or twelve ton wooden bodied wagons and as such it's quite easy to build representative trains using a mix of modified ready to run wagons and kit-built stock. Bitumen trains were associated with the Forest of Dean, inbound to the small receiving plant at Whimsey. This has been a more challenging traffic flow to model as there are only a few 14 Ton tank wagons available in either kit or



A Berry Wiggins Bitumen train arrives into Albion Yard. Occasionally we run something a little different. Not often, though, as too much of that removes the illusion of the 'ordinary' which the layout tries to portray. Bitumen trains would have been heavy when loaded, so this time we've double-headed the train inbound. This image shows the 'hidden' entry and exit point of the fiddle yard, the background houses giving the illusion of a parallel street to the inbound track whilst not overpowering the foreground. The steam you can see here and on an earlier image is dry ice - an idea originally shown to me by Pete Piczeck. For the photo session, myself and Chris Nevard obtained some dry ice from a commercial supplier and spent a few hours seeing what effects we could achieve. Some of them turned out surprisingly well, but it's not for the faint-hearted. Properly handling -75c gas and pouring it over your train set requires a certain amount of commitment, as well as the acceptance of potential damage!

in a nutshell



Albion Yard is fictional, and depicts an imagined small yard at Cinderford in the Forest of Dean, Gloucestershire. The era is firmly set in British Rail Western Region 1950s through to the end of Steam in the Forest in the early 1960s. Locomotives are modified ready to run models based on those seen working in the forest during that era. Rolling stock is a mixture of kit-built and modified ready to run wagons depicting vehicles using the same principle as the locomotives. Passenger stock isn't required because it's a goods-only facility. A few examples of diesels very occasionally run - including a Class

ready to run form. The stock I've used for the train is purely representative rather than accurate. I've re-liveried tank wagons from the Peco and Bachmann ranges using decals from Modelmaster, and the overall effect has been very satisfying. More recently I've been working on a ballast train as there were quarries which despatched ballast in 'Herring' wagons. This wagon has recently become

available in the Cambrian Models range and a few of them have been acquired to make a further recognisable train from the forest.

#### Moving on

In some ways it's a bit odd that I've started a ballast train, as the layout has been retired from the exhibition circuit. It did a handful of shows and was well received, but I've a desire

to build more Forest of Dean type layouts that are closer to the prototype in accuracy and operation. 'Albion Yard' taught me a good deal about presentation, particularly with regard to consistency of approach across the different skills required to build a successful, reliable and good-looking layout. ■

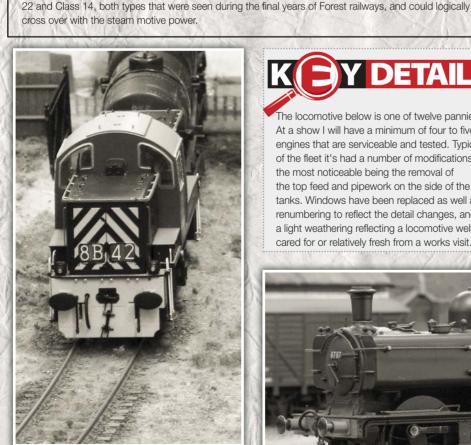

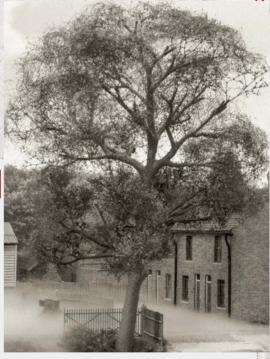

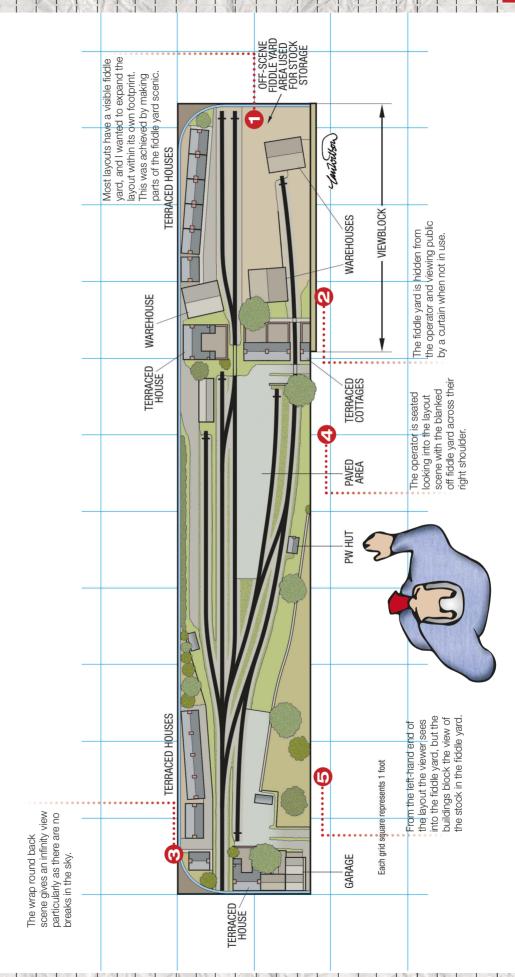
The locomotive below is one of twelve panniers. At a show I will have a minimum of four to five engines that are serviceable and tested. Typical of the fleet it's had a number of modifications, the most noticeable being the removal of the top feed and pipework on the side of the tanks. Windows have been replaced as well as renumbering to reflect the detail changes, and a light weathering reflecting a locomotive well cared for or relatively fresh from a works visit.

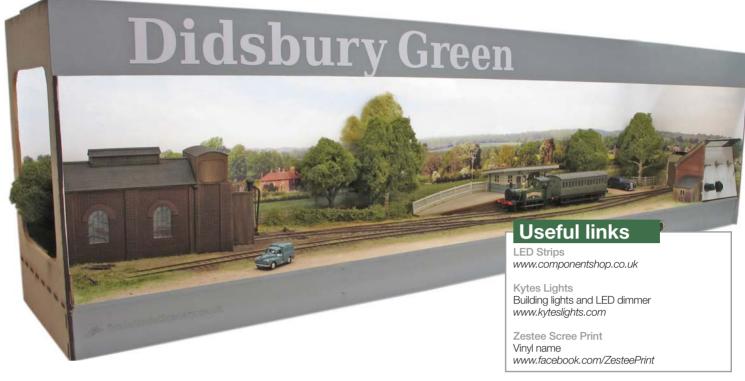

# FINISHING TOUCHES AT DIDSBURY GREEN

Phil Parker adds a fascia, lights and officially christens his Canada-bound project layout.

here's nothing like an exhibition deadline to concentrate the mind. With the London Festival of Railway Modelling approaching (at the time of writing), I need to solve the problem of providing 'Didsbury Green' with a fascia and some lighting.

Going to a show without lights is never a good idea. You can't guarantee you'll not be put in the gloomiest corner of a hall, and even if your spot is nice and bright, as soon as the crowds arrive, they will cast a shadow on your efforts. More to the point, any model railway looks better when properly illuminated. Bright lights make your efforts look a lot better. A mediocre model is improved, whereas a superb model without lights will always look poor.

Plan 'A' had been to make the fascia out of lightweight foamboard. Even with a strengthening plastic angle running the length of the layout to provide support, the overall weight would be tiny. There were only a couple of problems with this idea – I couldn't find a foamboard sheet long enough to avoid a very obvious join.

Worse, the stuff is pretty fragile. Reaching into the model for uncoupling or re-railing and catching your arm on it would dent or even break the panels. I like my trains to look well worn, not the layout itself.

Substituting MDF for the foamboard solved both problems. My local hardware store could cut 1.2m lengths to avoid joins and even the thin stuff can take a few knocks.

The fascia supports LED light strips. We tested these three months ago to see if they would give enough illumination and now it's time to fit them properly.

Next, the layout needs a coat of paint. Choosing a colour isn't easy but I've gone for a pale grey, as anything dark will dominate the scene. If you model a specific company, its livery can be a useful guide and will certainly make the model stand out.

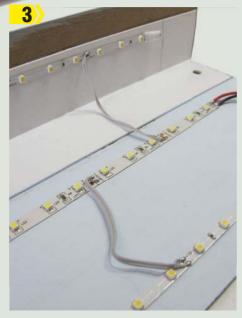
The finishing touch is a layout name and, just as I was looking for something, Lucy from Modellers Mecca announced she had set up a new business (called 'Zestee Print') screen printing vinyl signs and such, so I leapt in to become her first customer. £3.50 later, I had the name in a typeface of my choice ready to stick in place.

We made it with a few days to spare and fresh, bright and tidy, 'Didsbury Green' looked great at the show. It might be small, but quite a few people went home thinking that they might have a go at something similar.



Fascias need to be able to take a few knocks, so the core of this one is plastic angle. It's bolted to some supports made from offcuts of 2mm MDF left over from the fiddle yard construction shown last month.







LEDs can be a bit bright in such a small space so, I'll fit a dimmer switch to turn them down. It's simple to wire in 12V in one pair of screw terminals and a pair of wires to the light strips.

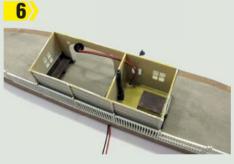


Sadly, the dimmer is too large to hide anywhere on the layout, but by taking all the components out of the case, I can fit them into the control panel. We aren't talking about mains voltages here, so this is all perfectly safe. While the panel is open, an on/off switch is fitted for the next stage



Rather than fit another transformer, power for the building lights comes from a couple of AA batteries fitted under the board. The power drain shouldn't be huge and I expect them to last a show as long as I switch them off occasionally.

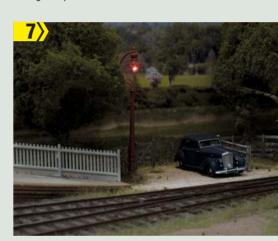
Self-adhesive lengths of LED strip are fixed in place and wired together. The outer lengths are warm white and the centre cool white giving a pretty good colour balance for a layout set in the endless English summer. I'd like to say the inside of the fascia is painted blue to reflect a nice sky colour, but I've just run out of white...



Lights are fitted into the station building, and engine shed. The hardest thing about using these pre-wired LEDs is gluing them into place so the lampshades hang down correctly, then routing the wires through the bottom of the board.



Finally, the fascia and front board are given a coat of Rust-Oleum Mineral Grey paint and the vinyl name is fixed in place using some masking tape to line it up with the bottom edge. This is easy - just peel the backing off the lettering and push firmly on the board. When happy, peel the front sheet away. It's far neater than I could paint by hand!



Ready-made lamps are fixed on the platform and station entrance. These have 12v bulbs and by running them at 3V, the same as the LEDs, they glow but don't cast too much light. I want to avoid illuminating the backscene photo, which never looks right.





Leftover plastic channel is perfect to support the baseboard while I paint the bottom edge. It lifts the layout clear of the worktop and stops me sticking it down with paint. I'll hang on to this for the future.

# RAILS ANNOUNCE 812 CLASS 0-6-0S



Rails of Sheffield has commissioned Bachmann Europe Plc to produce OO gauge models of the Caledonian Railway 812 Class 0-6-0 locomotives. Working in conjunction with the Caledonian Railway 828 Trust, the models exclusive to Rails of Sheffield are under development, following site surveys of the sole preserved prototype at the Strathspey Railway's Aviemore shed.

Five liveries of the locomotives are to be made available, with pre-order deposits of £30 being taken. These are Caledonian Railway blue livery No. 828 (as preserved), Caledonian Railway blue livery No. 828 (as originally built), LMS black livery No. 17566, BR black livery with early emblem No. 57565 (weathered) and BR black livery with late crest No. 57566.

The Caledonian Railway 812 Class designed by John F. McIntosh saw service in Scotland from 1899 until the final locomotive was withdrawn in 1963.

The first 17 mixed-traffic locomotives (Nos. 812 - 828) were built by the Caledonian Railway at its St. Rollox works, turned out in the distinctive Caledonian blue livery with a further 12 later that year.

At the turn of the 20th century the Caledonian found itself to be short of engines suitable for mineral traffic. With St. Rollox fully committed to other work, it turned to three outside contractors () A further 50 locomotives were built between Neilson Reid, Sharp Stewart and Dübs using the Class 812 drawings at the turn of the 20th Century, following a shortage of motive power for mineral traffic. The locomotives differed from the original batch only in having Drummond-style number plates (the originals having the McIntosh type) and

three-link couplings.

Some locomotives had Westinghouse pumps and screw-link couplings to enable them to be used on passenger services, but under LMS ownership after 1923, the pumps were removed as the class were painted into black. The remaining members of the class spent much of their time working coal and other mineral trains around Scotland.

No. 828 is preserved at the Strathspey Railway, running between Aviemore and Broomhill in the Highlands and starred at the Severn Valley Railway's Autumn Steam Gala in 2011, allowing a little modeller's license.

#### REVOLUTION TRAINS TO PRODUCE 'STURGEON'

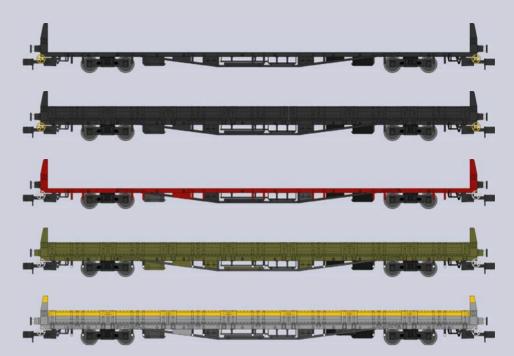
Revolution Trains announced at Model Rail Scotland its latest crowd-funded project, a Sturgeon engineers wagon – its second model for transition era N gauge modellers and its ninth crowd-funded model.

Revolution Trains has chosen the 'Sturgeon' A batch, the most common of variants, many of which were later converted into air-braked 'Tench' wagons. The manufacturer will offer the models with and without side doors. NEM couplers, a diecast chassis for weight and five liveries are to be offered as follows: black, Indian red, olive green, departmental yellow and engineers grey/yellow. Variants with and without side doors are also to be offered with a variety of single and triple wagon packs.

Subject to receiving enough orders and deposits, the models will be produced to pre-orders. RevolutioN has released artwork of the models, whilst it finalises research, but it expects each model to cost in the region of £28-30.

Based on an earlier LNER design adapted for BR's engineering department as bogie rail, sleeper and ballast carriers, more than 900 Sturgeons were built from 1952 to 1960 by Head Wrightson and BR.

The majority had seven dropside doors, but these were often removed along with



the ends to carry 60ft track panels. In later years some were fitted with airbrakes and recoded 'Tench'. The versatile wagons lasted in mainline service until 2003, with some in use within depots beyond 2010.

In service, 'Sturgeons' were seen in departmental trains alongside 'Salmon' track carriers, 'Dogfish', 'Sealion', 'Seacow' or 'Grampus' ballast wagons.

In other news, Revolution Trains has

received painted samples of its now tooled N gauge IZA Cargowaggon twins. The models depict vans introduced in 1986 which are still in service, used to carry products including mineral water, bagged china clay, electrical parts, steel and alcoholic drinks from the continent to the UK and from Cornwall to Scotland. #### END OF LINE FOR JLTRT

I will concentrate on my Leamington Spa layout. In the coming months, I expect to announce new plans, so watch this space."

His announcement continued "I believe there is a small niche for a high quality designer and manufacture, and that will



likely be my focus. The best models for discerning modellers and collectors." Follow updates on his Facebook page 'Railnuts'.

# TMC'S LNER G5 EXCLUSIVE

The Model Centre has revealed its plans that it is to produce OO gauge models of the LNER G5 0-4-4T - the model shop's first exclusive newly-tooled locomotive - working in conjunction with Bachmann Europe.

Models are to feature a Next-18 decoder interface, a speaker and firebox LEDs. In traditional style from the weathering specialist, in addition to the factoryfitted DCC ready versions, DCC fitted, sound-fitted and weathered options will be available from the TMC workshop. Ten variants of the G5 have been commissioned, each with detail variations, making them unique. Differences extend to boilers, bunkers, smokeboxes, smokebox doors, whistle positions and safety valves.

Its model in NER Lined Green depicts the new build G5, with the Class G5 Locomotive Company Limited receiving £10 from the sale of each sale of this variant to assist bringing back a long-lost locomotive of the North East.

The price of the models had yet to be announced as this issue went to press, but is expected to be determined as the models approach delivery. Ongoing since March 2017, TMC declared that the project is at the detailed research stage with models to be produced as follows:

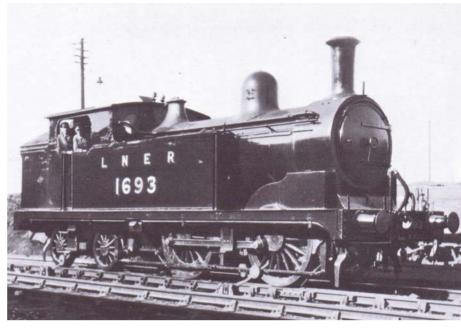

Designed by Wilson Worsdell for the North Eastern Railway, 110 of these locomotives were built between 1894 and 1901. The NER designated them as Class O, becoming Class G5 in LNER days and they served on passenger trains throughout the North Eastern Region, lasting into BR days. The G5's could also be found on branch Freight and as station pilots. Some were transferred away



Built in 1897, G5 No. 1693 didn't receive its new number until 1946, when it became No. 7301. In 1929 a vacuum eiector was fitted and it became 67301 under BR, until withdrawn in 1955 from Hull Botanic Gardens. STEVEN **GORICK** 

from the North East in the 1930s, a small group migrating to the Great Eastern section at Stratford and then Cambridge. Another group was transferred to Scotland primarily for employment on pilot duties at Aberdeen and Inverurie Works, as well as at Keith and on the Banff branch. None of the class were preserved but The Class G5 Locomotive Co. Ltd is well advanced with its new build locomotive.

The Class experienced numerous detail alterations throughout their lives, the most obvious being the fitting of push/pull gear to a number of G5s during the 1930s. The first withdrawal of the class occurred in June 1948, but it was several years later before withdrawals gathered pace as DMUs took over traditional duties. A few locomotives gained the BR 'late crest' and at the beginning of December 1958, 11 were still in service, the last withdrawals being at the end of that month.

Chris Yates, proprietor of TMC, commented "With 26 members of the class based sometime during their lives at either Whitby, Pickering or Malton sheds, they were no strangers to the North Yorkshire Moors Railway and consequently it seems a totally logical choice for us to commission this locomotive given that so many of them would have passed so close to our premises during their operating lives."

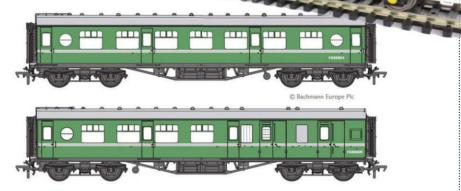

# THE HOLDEN F5 STEAM LOCOMOTIVE TRUST





#### Recreating a Great Eastern Railway Classic

The Holden F5 Steam Locomotive Trust is building a full-size working replica of 2-4-2T No.789.

Set up in the year 2000, the Trust's aim is to help fill a substantial gap in the Heritage Railway market.

The original GER 789 was built in 1904 as Class M15 (LNER F4). This was one of several locomotives to be rebuilt (GER M15r / LNER F5). However, No.789 and sister locomotive No.790 were rebuilt with GER Class G69 (LNER F6) cabs. As a result of this, the two locomotives were incorrectly classified, which affected their route availability.

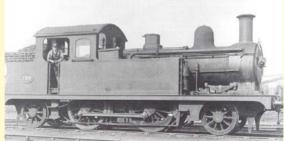
The class was associated with the east London suburban routes; in particular the branches from London Liverpool Street to Chingford and Enfield Town. No.789 was renumbered No. 7218 under the 1946 LNER scheme. Under British Railways, 60000 was added to the ex-LNER locos' numbers. In December 1948 BR gave No.67218 her correct F5 classification.

No. 67218 was one of seven F5s to be fitted with trip cock working and push-and-pull gear, for branch line operation. Initially based at Yarmouth, No. 67218 was relocated to Epping, where she would see out the rest of her working days on the line to and from Ongar.

Electrification had begun to take hold of the suburban routes by the mid-1950s and the 2-4-2 tank engines were fast becoming obsolete. By the end of May 1958 all of the F4s, F5s and F6s had been scrapped.

60 years on and the Trust is progressing well with the rebirth of No.789. At the time of writing the frame plates, cylinder blocks, motion bracket, star stay and buffer beams are awaiting assembly at Tyseley Locomotive Works, Birmingham. This is subject to the agreement of a lease at the Whitwell and Reepham Railway in Norfolk.

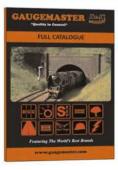

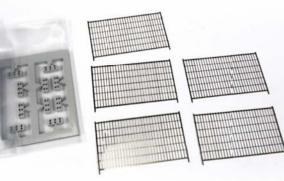

#### **PROTOTYPE INSPIRATION**



Network Rail Assistant Signalling Designer, Simon Paley, explains the differences and development of Britain's newest Inter-city Express Trains, set to replace the Class 125 HSTs.

he Class 800s, also known as Intercity Express Trains (IETs) or Super Express Trains (SETs), are the UK's latest generation of high speed, intercity trains and are slowly being introduced across the Great Western, and soon, East Coast networks.

#### Class 800 History

In 2005, the Department of Transport (DfT) launched its program to replace the fleet of Intercity Class 125 'High Speed Trains', with the project being called HST2. In November 2007 the initial specification for an Intercity Express Program was issued, not only for trains but also construction and maintenance facilities.

This specification identified the need for three different versions of the trains based on their power supply; electrically powered via overhead line equipment, diesel powered or a new concept of bi-mode, the ability to use either OLE or diesel power as well as being able to change between the two on the move.

Construction of the trains started in earnest after the order, with the first test train arriving in the UK in March 2015. In April 2016, Virgin Trains East Coast unveiled its 'Azuma' (Japanese for 'East') brand name,

although GWR has yet to apply a generic name to its fleet. The first service train operated by a Class 800 was on October 16, 2017 by GWR, with the fleet gradually increased over the following months.

#### Design and construction

The Class 800 units are based on Hitachi's AT300 product which spans the Class 395 and the rest of the Class 80x units. The AT300 is based on Hitachi's highly successful Bullet Trains for Japanese Railways. Initially its design was similar to the HST, with the end driving cars being non-passenger and containing transformers or electrical generators, with distributed power motors on each coach. This was changed in 2010 to use underfloor transformers with diesel engines allowing them to carry passengers.

The unit's bodies are constructed from aluminium using friction stir welding techniques at Hitachi's Facility at Kasado, Japan. The bodies are then shipped to Hitachi's assembly facility at Newton Aycliffe in County Durham where they are fitted out with interiors, electrical equipment, MTU engines from Germany and bogies from Italy. Despite being an international train, the IET has several UK suppliers. The first three 'pre-series' trains were entirely built in Japan before manufacturing switched to the UK.

The units are marketed in 5- or 9-car formations, but the design allows the trains to be extended up to 12-cars in length, although no operator has taken up the offer. Some issues with IETs along intended routes have required platforms to be lengthened or modified to cope with the additional overhang of the coaches on curves. The formations for the 5- and 9-car are as follows:

- 5-Car = DPTS (Driving Pantograph Trailer Second)-MS (Motor Second)-MS-MC (Motor Composite)-DPTF (Driving Pantograph Trailer First)
- 9-Car = DPTS MS MS TS (Trailer Second) - MS - TS - MC - MF (Motor First) - DPTF

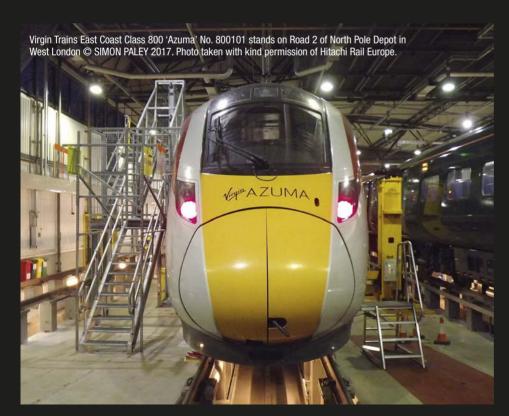
#### **Passenger Facilities**

Class 800s have seating for between 270 and 526 standard class passengers in 2+2 seating and between 45 and 101 first class passengers in 2+1 seating depending on the train formation. The seating has been described as firm by many, but will improve over time.

The catering arrangements for the trains depend on the operator with GWR opting for a trolley service for standard class passengers and a full kitchen service for first class passengers. Virgin has specified a buffet in one of its trailer seconds for its standard class passengers and kitchen service for First Class passengers.

#### **Bi-Mode Operation**

All IETs are electric multiple units because the drive to the axles comes from a bogie-hung electric motor via a gear box. However, what makes the IETs different is how the motors obtain their power.

Each Class 800 train is fitted with a number of diesel engines, MTU V12 1600 R80L's, that are connected to an electric generator, as well as a pantograph on each driving car. On Class 800 units, three (for a 5-Car) or five (for a 9-car) engines are fitted to the trailer cars, whilst the Class 801 units have only a single diesel engine for emergency use. These diesel generator sets can be dropped from the unit to be removed or swapped for a new engine.

The Class 800 units are capable of running off both the electricity from the on-board generators and the overhead wires, this has resulted in some key lineside details being added in the form of Eurobalises and traction change-over signage in the areas where the procedure takes place. There are two different horn volumes; one for 'neighbour friendly' urban areas at speeds less than 100mph and a louder horn for over 100mph.

#### Operations and Future

The Class 800s are currently maintained by Hitachi at dedicated facilities at North Pole (opposite Old Oak Common), Stoke Gifford (Bristol) and Doncaster. Hitachi is planning facilities at Maliphant Depot in Swansea, Bounds Green in London and Clayhills in Aberdeen. Daily servicing will also take place at GWR / VTEC depots by Hitachi.

Over the next couple of years, the beloved HSTs on the GWML and ECML will be replaced by IETs and these cascaded to Scotland and the Midland Mainline, so I guess it's time to think of a proper name for the 800s. I would suggest 'Lizards'.

## HORNBY HITACHI IEP CLASS 800/0



Hornby is well known for creating models of high speed streamline trains, with the A4, HST, Pendolino and Class 395 Javelin all featuring in its catalogue. The latest in this range is the Hitachi Class 800 Bi-Mode Multiple Unit 'Intercity Express Train', the model of which was announced at Warley 2016.

Kindly supplied for review, this Train Pack contains a five-car Class 800 finished in GWR's Dark Green Livery as No. 800004 and named Sir Isambard Kingdom Brunel / Daniel Gooch on each driving car. Hornby is also producing a pack of two driving cars finished in Hitachi's Red and White Test unit No. 800002, these are limited to 500 pieces. Available later in the year will be packs of two driving cars and three trailers in GWR colours.

#### FIRST IMPRESSIONS

Hornby has captured the streamlined look of the Class 800 well. The detail on the roof of each coach includes all the necessary air-conditioning, electrical conduits and diesel engine exhaust of the real thing. The body and underframe detail are just as impressive, even extending down to glazed internal doors. The only slight let-down is a plastic non-working pantograph, which on our sample refused to stay in the raised position.

Hornby has done a superb job of scaling the GWR Brunswick Green Livery, effectively capturing the white edges around the doors. The printing of smaller details is well defined, although the edges of the open nose cone should be yellow rather than black and the washer port on the nose should be silver.

It should be noted that the real 800004 has additional Network Rail and DfT branding on the driving cars and hasn't got the First Class designations applied, although these should be white on the model instead of black.

#### **PERFORMANCE**

On uneven track one bogie of coach B derailed on curves when being propelled by the power car Built for speed, but rather handsome nonetheless, Hornby has captured the sleek profile of the Class 800 well

at the back. This was due to the clearance between the suspension damper anchor and the suspension damper on the bogie. This issue was not present when running with the power car leading or after the track was levelled out. However, this isn't always possible, so a more permanent fix would be a thin washer on the bogie mount of any affected bogies.

Once this issue was ironed out, the unit ran smoothly and quietly throughout the speed range and in both directions, and through point work and curves. The model is provided with directional head and tail lights as well as interior lighting, although the headlight above the screen should be much dimmer, smaller and a yellow shade. The interior lights are a little disappointing under DC, as they should be brighter and white rather than yellow, but this maybe hampered by the tinted glazing.

Modellers should be aware of the additional overhang of this model compared with previous models, which may cause some clearance problems on some layouts. Therefore a cautionary run should be undertaken.





apart for storage, it means that the model requires a pair of DCC decoders to control the head and tail lights on each driving car. A standard 8-pin DCC decoder socket is located on the underframe of each of the driving cars. Once the moulding has been unscrewed, the blanking plug can be swapped for a decoder. It is recommended

that a decoder with a thin pin interface is used due to the limited space between the PCB and bottom of the underframe. At inner end of each moulding there is a cavity for either a decoder or a standard 20mm x 40mm speaker, but no provision has been made to independently control the interior lights.

#### **OPINION**

Despite some curable performance issues and reduced DCC provision, Hornby has done a great job with the Class 800. Whilst the cost may be high for some people, the finish and attention to detail makes me think it is value for money. Overall, this model is a very worthy representation of the future of high speed intercity rail travel.

#### HATTON'S 14IN & 16IN ANDREW BARCLAY 0-4-0STs



It's less than five years ago when I tried bending some manufacturers' ears about the possibility of small industrial steam locomotives, such as Pecketts and Barclays. Maybe they weren't ignoring my ramblings after all? To be fair, Hatton's Model Railways were not one of the companies I'd badgered as, at that point, it wasn't a manufacturer.

Time has moved on and this is its second locomotive, directly produced in China following its excellent SE&CR 'P' Class which we reviewed last month

Andrew Barclay Sons & Co. was a locomotive building company based in Kilmarnock, Scotland. It became known for producing standardised saddle tank locomotives, mainly for industrial use. It had a small selection of options available to prospective buyers, with variations including two different cab front windows, four different cab rear windows, two types of buffer shanks, two types of buffers, tank steps (where appropriate), lubricators (where appropriate), two different front spring heights and two different water tank heights.

The most numerous type produced was the 14in and 16in versions, referring to the diameter of the cylinders. Thousands of 0-4-0s were built by Andrew Barclay, starting in the late 1800s. Many survived longer than mainline steam under BR, with some still running in the late 1970s. A substantial number found life in preservation, especially in formative heritage schemes.

#### FIRST IMPRESSIONS

Once again, the model is nicely packaged and protected. We are becoming a little more used to diminutive models and, at 93mm in length, the little Barclay is certainly small. However, there is a respectable weight to it of 120g, which gives the feel that it will be up to the job. The quality of paint finish and decoration is excellent too, with appropriately

coloured motion dependent on the individual locomotive through to lining and lettering to the highest standards.

We received three models that show most of the potential variations within the range. Firstly, the GWR green model with shirtbutton crest portrays similar locomotives, which were under the ownership of the Swansea Harbour Railways Trust when acquired by the Great Western at grouping and displays a livery worn in preservation on the East Somerset Railway in the 1990s. Although neatly printed, the cabside numberplate would have looked better as an etched plate, but this is something that the modeller can address. The all-over green body colour shows an area of the model that drew criticism from RMweb observers, with less undercut beneath the boiler in the middle of the locomotive than would be seen on the real thing. This is because of the need to accommodate the mechanism and is not particularly noticeable in use or, indeed, when painted black. Close-up photography makes it look worse than it is.





These models are crying out for a crew, particularly when it's an openbacked cab so Hatton's, in another first, has commissioned Modelu, (runner up in the 'Innovation Category' of this year's BMRA awards) to produce a 3D printed crew scanned from suitably-dressed modellers. These are now available to order as unpainted models at £9 per crew.

GWR 705 has the smaller 14in cylinders, the smaller sized saddle tanks, a fully enclosed cab with square windows, whereas the W.T.T liveried model has elongated oval cab windows to the rear and lubricators to the running plate. The works plate on the cabside of W.T.T. is beautifully printed, but I would be heading straight to Narrow Planet to order some etched plates. Of the three models provided, my favourite is NCB No. 6, with its open-backed cab showing the level of detail on the backhead. Inside the cab its evident that a single glazing piece is used for the front spectacle glasses, something I would probably remove and replace in detailing the model.

A little care is needed in removing the body from the chassis. A small pair of tweezers to loosen the piping beneath the middle of the tanks should make it easy to drop the chassis out to then fit a decoder inside the model. In front of the small but capable motor, the circuit board with decoder socket is tidily mounted between clips. Just remove the board from the retaining clips and plug in a direct six-pin decoder – Hatton's recommends the Gaugemaster DCC23 as a suitable fit.

On test the model proved to be smooth, quiet and very capable, easily taking six Mk1 carriages around the track and four over 1-in-30 gradients. Although it's a short wheelbase I didn't experience any hesitation over short and long radius pointwork, so I was really quite pleased with the performance overall.

#### **OPINION**

There are many more liveries to choose from in the future, but I have my eyes on the usefulness of the base product to replicate some of the more unusual variations seen in industrial life; the open-cabbed trio of locomotives at Stewarts & Lloyd's steelworks at Bilston are calling me. Hatton's launch line-up has many attractive and unusual liveries in the range and I'm a bit of a sucker for late steam industrials with wasp stripes, so the Corn Products 16in model will be irresistible.

Well done Hatton's for making my wishlist come true! There is a little work to do to bring it up to top notch for the modeller but it's a very good product, although I think the P class just edges it for decoration and cuteness.

#### KERNOW MODEL RAIL CENTRE YCV 'TURBOT'



A departmental wagon with almost a thousand examples found right across the network from the 1980s to 2000s and which has not appeared in readyto-run format before? Yes, it's surprising, but thanks to Kernow Model Rail Centre we now have the 'Turbot' bogie ballast wagon.

British Railways designed and produced the Bogie Bolster E wagon in 1960/1 but, as steel traffic declined in the 1980s, the wagons still had a useful chassis life and were converted to have steel drop-side doors for transporting ballast for permanent way works. The wagon ends received angled plates to reduce the amount of spillage between the wagons.

Turbot wagons could be found in longer rakes or singly mixed with other fishkind wagons across the country; normally battered, bruised and dirty, but we now have the start point to add to track maintenance workings.

The accuracy and detail levels of the wagon body are good, with crisp and clear decoration. There is planking inside the wagon bed and this is carried over to the underside of the floor, with good brake rigging and cylinder detail. Some comment has been made about the depth of the queen posts and trusses, but I feel that the model is broadly correct in this respect. The appearance that they are too low may be the result of the brake gear V-hangers being a couple of millimetres undersized.

Observations have been made that the wagon rides too high. The bogies and wheels are the correct size, but there is a greater than prototypical space between the tops of the bogie and wheels and the body. This looks to be the result of a spacing disc on both the bogie frame and body underside to allow sufficient slope for operating on typical model track. If the spacing was as per the prototype there would inevitably be some catching. If the modeller wishes to improve this aspect it is a relatively easy task to pare away the spacing disc.

Overall this model is a great addition to infrastructure workings and I can't be alone in hoping that we see a Bogie Bolster E at some point utilising the same underframe.

## BACHMANN LNER 'TEAK' THOMPSON STOCK



coach range, with the BR crimson and cream liveried examples. The models were very well received for the accuracy and decoration, achieving a second place in the coaching stock category in the BMRA results to its Birdcage stock; no mean feat.

I know that the team at Barwell went through several iterations of the decoration sample stage to achieve a faux teak finish for the LNER livery versions as delivered in the 1940s. Now happy with the results, the late LNER and early BR modeller has another treat to look forward to.

The steel-sided prototypes had what described as an 'ersatz' teak finish applied by brush to the flat sides to mimic the teak panels of the earlier Gresley stock, which they would initially run with in service. Prototype images show that the finish varied somewhat and heritage repaints show an even greater variety, so it was difficult for Bachmann to determine what to match these to. Even when I've shown initial images of these models to RMweb readers the reactions have ranged right across the board. I feel it's actually a very pleasing effect, the artificial panelled appearance is well captured with different grain directions and intensity. The effect is achieved by tampo printing a lighter grain effect over a darker base layer on the sides and ends of the coaches. At normal viewing this gives a subtle variety to the sides, although our close-up images serve to show how the effect has been achieved.

The decoration of the lettering and numbers with five different colours is particularly neat and vibrant. The metallic printing of the class identification and smoking symbols on the inside of the windows bears very close scrutiny. I'm sure the off-white roof wouldn't have stayed looking like that for long, even the coach sides seemed to dull down and attract dirt a lot in any colour images seen. The 'white-walled' tyres on the russet painted wheels add a touch of post-war glamour and the door furniture is accurately picked out with metallic gold.

The 3rd Brake is still on its way, but I note that it lacks any LNER branding and is numbered E1914, so is appropriate for immediately after nationalisation. A nice follow-up to the initial range launch last year.



Two models were supplied for review - to the left. First Class Corridor No.138 and No.1146 Composite Brake on the right.

Tampo printing a lighter faux grain over a darker shade provides a subtle, and rather pleasing effect.

Ready-to-run manufacturers in 4mm scale have faced a dilemma for some time - they are running out of prototypes, or at least prototypes that will have enough appeal to sell in reasonable numbers.

Upgrading older models can be popular, but the market wants something new.

Bachmann surprised us four years ago when it announced a range of models in 009 - that is 4mm: 1ft scale running on 9mm (N gauge) trackwork to represent narrow gauge prototypes. To tie-in with the anniversary of the start of WW1, the first locomotive was to be a War Department (WD) Baldwin. These locomotives found homes on many different lines after the hostilities, and an excuse can be made for them to appear pretty much anywhere in the country, in virtually every era.



To differentiate the 009 gauge range from other Bachmann products, a mid-green box is used, but otherwise the packaging is familiar. A clear plastic sleeve retains a clam-shell plastic inner that holds the model securely. Inside are accessories, etched name and works plates.

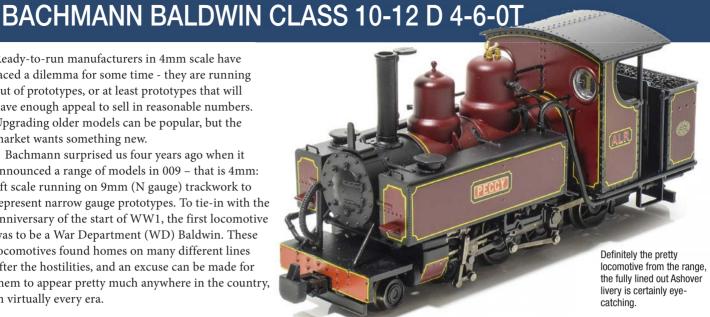
Extracted from the box, first impressions were surprising. It helps that for review is the pretty Ashover Light Railway edition (maroon and fully lined as opposed to black), but this is a very detailed and surprisingly small model. At 73mm over its buffer beams, it's small compared to 00 gauge locomotives. Running a rule over the model and comparing this with the Roy Link drawing in Narrow Gauge and Industrial Railway Modelling Review issue No. 76 shows the dimensions are spot on.

Despite the size, the model is festooned with detail. Behind the vacuum pipes, a balance pipe connects tanks. The smokebox door has the requisite number of rivets. Moving back along the boiler, a baffle is fitted to the back of the chimney. Two domes, the front a sandbox in traditional American style follow,

then a maze of pipework between the tank backs and cab front. All seem firmly fitted and compared to prototype photographs, as close to scale thickness as possible using plastic.

'Peggy' has an open-backed cab, but the closed version is also fitted to the appropriate models. Half-moon shaped shades are fitted above some spectacle plates, however, when you look inside the cab, the window glazing with a single clear moulding is very obvious. This won't be a problem for closed cab variants and those with open cabs can cure the problem with a little matt back paint. The eye is drawn here because of the nicely modelled cab fittings, so the effort of this and adding a crew would be well worthwhile.

Decoration is up to Bachmann's usual standards. The lining is neat and well-applied with sharp paint edges. All panels are lined including the cab front and buffer beams. Brass items are painted but in a realistically dull sheen - nothing gaudy here. Name and works plates are printed, but etched versions are included for modellers who wish to fit them.

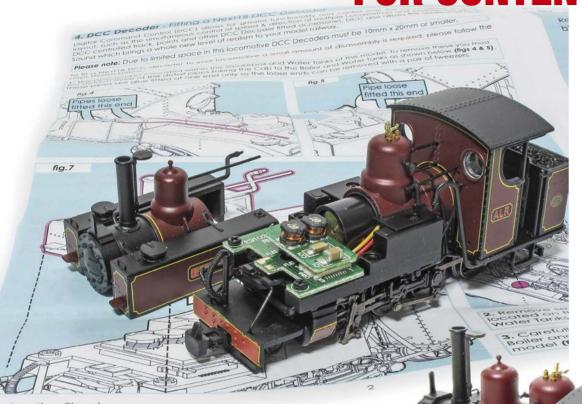
#### Under the footplate

The firms' experience with the Lilliput range of narrow gauge models has paid dividends. Inside the tanks, removed by loosening three pipes and undoing a pair of cross-head screws underneath, is a flywheel-fitted coreless motor. The gear train is arranged inside the firebox driving the rear axle. American prototypes feature bar frames with a large gap between them and the bottom of the boiler. This too is on the model, you have to get down to eye-level to see, but you can't fail to be impressed by the engineering.

An 18-pin DCC socket is fitted, designed around Bachmann's Next-18 decoder, although any Next-18 decoder at 10mm by 20mm or smaller should fit. If you want sound you'll be pleased to know a speaker is integrated. Turning the model on its back reveals

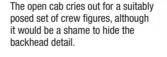
another bit of clever engineering. The prototype is a 4-6-0, but this model is a 2-2-6-0. The rear front bogie wheels are firmly attached to the chassis, only the front set swing as a pony truck. Talking to the designer, there was a problem with bogie swing behind the cylinders, so this was the pragmatic solution. The subterfuge isn't apparent from the side and as a bonus, we get an extra set of wheels fitted with pickups.

Running, even straight from the box, is very sweet with a suitably low top speed. Nine inch radius Peco Setrack 009 curves are fine and I suspect you might manage a little tighter if you really need to. The tiny valve gear moves well and seems robust enough to stand up to careful handling and running.

#### **Opinion**

If this isn't a very serious contender for model of the year at the next BMRA awards, I'll be astounded. The longer I spend looking at it from every angle, the more impressed I become. It's also a model that 009 modellers have been waiting for. More to the point, many 00 modellers will be considering adding a narrow-gauge feeder line to their layouts.

Most retailers are selling the model for around 20 pounds less than RRP, which seems very reasonable. You don't get a massive model for your money, but it is a real gem. With the Ashover Light Railway coach promised, or already available in kit form from Dundas Models, will there be a rush of 009 gauge layouts? I'd hope so. ■

# MINIATURE HEROES: THE WD'S 10-12-DS

Ben Jones profiles the US-built narrow gauge 4-6-0PTs that played a vital role in the British Army's battles during the 1914-18 'Great War' - and discovers how some found a new life in Britain afterwards.



espite its pioneering role in developing light railways across the world, Britain was a relatively late convert to their deployment on the battlefield. Extensive use of light railways to support military action, providing lines of communication between rear bases and battlefields, started after their usefulness had been demonstrated in the American Civil War. Towards the end of the 19th century, the British Army's Royal Engineers developed strategic light railways for use in frontier areas of the British Empire, most notably the North West Frontier of India. In peacetime they also provided new links to open up many rural areas for economic development.

Unlike many previous conflicts, the 1914-18 'Great War' stabilised into 'fronts' in France and Belgium, where the opposing sides faced each other for many months, fighting from extensive networks of trenches.

Constant shelling from both sides, bad weather and the mass movement of men, horses and heavy equipment turned the fields of Flanders and the Ardennes into an almost impassable morass of sludge, rendering the existing forms of transport - horses, mules and primitive early lorries - almost useless.

#### Standardisation

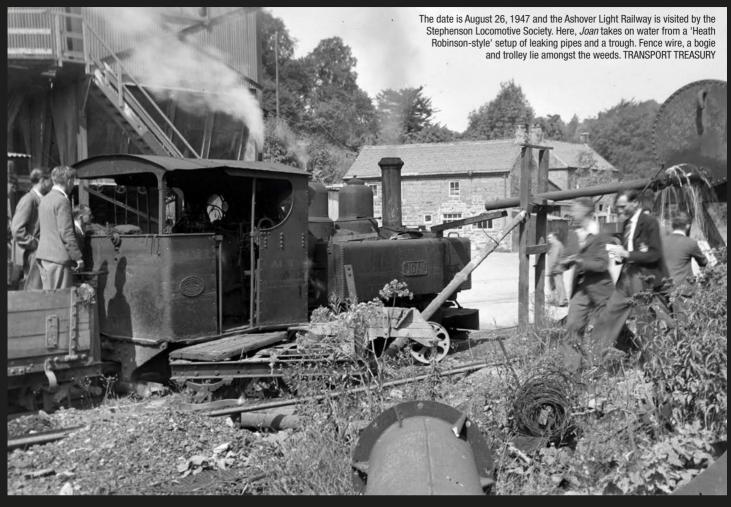
From 1915 onwards, the British War Department Light Railways (WDLR) developed a highly standardised system of field railways, using 4-6-0T steam locomotives for the main lines of communication and 20hp petrol tractors in various forms for movements at the

front. Standard bogie wagons - opens and vans – were built in large quantities to carry everything from munitions to food and, in the opposite direction, casualties of the fighting.

The most numerous and best-known of the WDLR's narrow gauge steam locomotives was the Baldwin 10-12-D 4-6-0PT, 495 of which were built in the USA in just seven months between October 1916 and April 1917. Of those, all but nine locomotives lost at sea during shipment from the USA saw service in Europe and became the WDLR's standard 4-6-0T. Hunslet of Leeds also built a batch of 4-6-0T locomotives to a similar specification, but the British locomotive building industry was already fully engaged and could not match the prodigious output of Baldwin's works in Philadelphia. It manufactured no fewer than 5,551 locomotives - and more than six million artillery shells - for the Allied war effort during the First World War.

As is often the case with locomotives built for war, the 10-12-Ds were simple, robust, quick and cheap to build and easy to maintain in difficult conditions. Their maximum load was only six 10-ton wagons, although this was often considerably reduced by poor track conditions.

Although most were deployed in northeastern France and Belgium in 1916-18, fighting at locations such as Arras, Passchendaele and Ypres, some of the class found their way to other theatres of war. Baldwin Nos. 45163–222 were renumbered by the War Office to WDLR, Middle East Nos. 581-640 and shipped to Egypt for use in Sinai and Palestine during the 1917 offensive against the Ottoman Empire and German forces. Most remained in the Middle East after the war.



#### **Army Surplus**

After November 1918, many of the still-serviceable Baldwins were sold and went on to work in France, Britain and India. Being light, reasonably powerful and cheap to buy and operate, they were ideal for many light railways, which were often lightly-built and perennially on the verge of bankruptcy. The Indian North Western Railway obtained 50 locomotives which became NWR Nos. 1–50.

A small number were brought back to the UK by the War Department and sold to minor railways in England and Wales. At the time, the Baldwins were seen as ideal, affordable replacements for Victorian narrow-gauge locomotives, in some cases dating from the opening of their railways.

The Welsh Highland Railway, linking Porthmadog and Caernarfon in north Wales, was part of the Col. Stephens light railway empire and obtained Baldwin No. 590 to bolster the indigenous fleet, consisting of Vulcan 0-6-4T *Moel Tryfan* and Hunslet 2-6-2T *Russell*. Unfortunately, the new 4-6-0T proved unpopular with crews – being regarded as unreliable and a rough rider with difficult controls and inadequate adhesion. Stephens' plans to buy more Baldwins never

materialised. By 1936 it was out of use at Boston Lodge Works and it was withdrawn a year later when the WHR closed.

Russell and No. 590 were stored in Dinas shed, and when the Second World War broke out they were examined by Ministry of War officials with a view to restoring them to use. Although Russell was removed for further use, No. 590 was broken up at Dinas. Despite its unpopularity at the time, a similar Baldwin 4-6-0T was imported from India by

the Welsh Highland Heritage Railway and is currently being restored in Porthmadog to create a replica.

The Glyn Valley Tramway (GVT), which linked quarries in the Ceiriog Valley to the Great Western Railway main line at Chirk, acquired a lone Baldwin 10-12-D in 1921. Works number 45211 of 1917, the locomotive became GVT No. 4 and was obtained primarily to haul freight trains from the granite quarries above Glyn

Ceiriog. GVT passenger trains ceased at the beginning of 1933, followed by freight services in July 1935, and No. 4 was scrapped along with the line's other locomotives a year later.

#### English narrow gauge

Snailbeach District Railways in Shropshire was another part of the Col. Stephens light railway empire from 1923. Two army surplus Baldwins were acquired to re-equip the line that year, rebuilt to the unusual gauge of 2ft 4in. Built to carry lead ore from mines to a GWR railhead at Pontesbury, on the Shrewsbury-Minsterley branch, it also carried stone in later years, and brought coal from Pontesford up the branch.

Baldwins Nos. 44383 and 44522, built in 1916/17, were acquired from the WDLR and became SDR Nos. 3 and 4. When the lead

mines closed the line lost much of its traffic but was rescued by a new flow of stone from Callow Hill Quarry. However, by 1947 the railway was moribund and all three surviving steam locomotives on the line were unusable. They were cut up at Snailbeach in 1950.

The Ashover Light Railway was a late addition to the ranks of British light railways and operated a passenger service between 1925 and 1936. Four 'army surplus' Baldwins were given the names Peggy, Hummy, Joan and Guy, with Bridget and Guy II arriving later.

Guy was reportedly worn out after being used to haul construction trains on the line and was used as a source of spare parts until broken up in 1939. Guy II was out of use by 1936 and scrapped in 1943. Bridget, Hummy and Joan had fallen out of use by 1945, 1946 and 1948 respectively, leaving Peggy to

handle the remaining traffic until the line closed March 31, 1950. After a last inspection trip in October of that year, the surviving Baldwins were scrapped in 1951.

Four 10-12-Ds have been preserved. No. 778, the prototype used by Bachmann to research its 4mm:1ft scale model, is active at the Leighton Buzzard Railway in Bedfordshire, while No. 794 is under restoration at the Welsh Highland Heritage Railway in Porthmadog. Both were imported from India. Baldwin works numbers 44657 (WDLR No. 779) and 45190 were imported from the Ryam Sugar Railway in India by the Statfold Barn Railway in 2013 and are awaiting restoration.

Baldwin No. 45215 of 1917 is preserved at the Dreamworld Railway in Queensland, Australia.

# TAIL LAMP

How we can encourage more youngsters to investigate the railway modelling pastime, wonders North Norfolk Railway's Education Manager, Daisy Robinson.

e all love our hobbies. They fulfil many things for many people, and frankly we can't understand why more folks don't get the same kick out of the subject as us. So it is for collectors and makers of model railways, and the answer is 'get them young'.

It should be easy! Children are inundated with trains from an early age. Peppa Pig has a land train, Sylvanian Families have their own train, 'Thomas' has numerous locomotive friends, both steam and diesel, The Polar Express, the Railway Children, and train sets still rate on the nation's top ten Christmas gifts. 'Train mania' is everywhere.

The railway preservation movement is certainly doing its bit; they have trains, the real thing, and many heritage lines and museums also have working model railways in a variety of scales. Not only this, but some, through specialist education departments teach thousands of young visitors about the life and history of all aspects of the amazing railway world.

Some of these organisations, such as the North Norfolk Railway, run active Young Volunteer Clubs, encouraging a new generation of 'train buffs' to get involved, setting days aside for younger enthusiasts to have hands-on experience of 'big trains' and the opportunity to run some of the model sections on their own. So why are there not more young people involved in railway modelling? Moreover, what can we do about it?

For me, the picture simply has to be bigger. If we want to encourage a new generation of modellers, as many people as possible involved in the hobby need to be out there helping to make it happen. Model manufacturers could be looking at the model kits they create too. Are there entry level starter kits suitable for a younger modeller, do they all require a degree in engineering to build, and does the cost of kits make the hobby unobtainable for some younger enthusiasts?

Modelling magazines could produce a 'Junior Club' edition with age appropriate projects, 'the history of', articles, challenges and competitions. Children love winning things. You would have to have been living in a cave for the last 60 years not to remember writing poems, stories and answering questions just to win a 'Blue Peter' badge.

But, at the end of the day the best people to encourage the 'new kids on the block' are those makers and collectors out there asking "How can we get younger people interested in our hobby?" Those of us on the rock face can make the biggest impact.

Approach local schools and take exhibition layouts to show-and-tell sessions. Borrow the school hall for the weekend to set out your club's display and offer the children a 'have a go' day. Think about the shop brand created specifically for the 'War Gaming' hobby - never has model painting been so popular. We should be tapping into

this enthusiasm, so start a junior section in your modelling club and be there helping the younger members to build and work on themed projects. Encourage them, bring the hobby to life and make it real. ■
