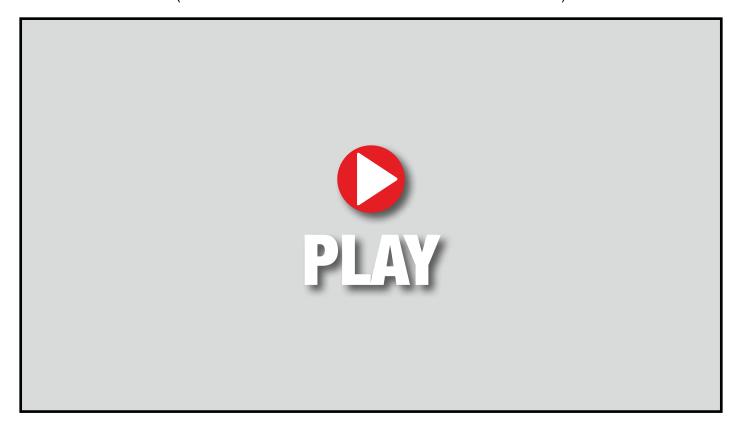

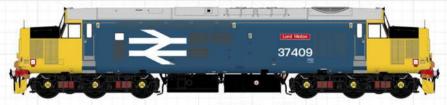

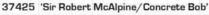

Pictured carrying North Eastern Railway red and cream as No. 3170 (RL3171), the model is to be joined by classmate No. 3171 (RL3172) in the same livery, which they both carried between 1904 and 1930. A third model, depicting No. 3170 later in its career in LNER brown (RL3173) will complete the batch.

In 1903, a pair of railcars was unveiled by the NER, led by Vincent Raven, its Assistant Chief Mechanical Engineer. Forerunners to locomotives powered by internal combustion engines linked to electric motors, the Autocars carried their own power plant – a petrol engine – driving a dynamo which supplied power to the traction motors. It was the world's first use of an internal combustion engine in a passenger carrying rail vehicle. The two Autocars, Nos. 3170 and 3171, were fittled with electric track brakes, another first for the railways.

No. 3171 was withdrawn in 1930 and No. 3170 in 1931. The body of No. 3170 has been restored and mated to a chassis in working order by The 1903 Electric Autocar Trust.

KERNOW TO PRODUCE GBRF CLASS 50S FOR 'N'



Model retailer, Kernow Model Rail Centre has commissioned Dapol to produce two N gauge Class 50 models in GBRf colours. Kernow Model Rail Centre's models will reflect the small but important differences between the livery of the two locomotives. 50007 *Hercules* and 50049 *Defiance* were unveiled on March 20, 2019 at Eastleigh following their repainting into GBRf colours. 50007 was revealed to have the identity of 50014 *Warspite* on one side.

Expected mid-2021, models in the twin-pack are to be made available in DCC-ready, DCC-fitted and DCC sound-fitted guises.

GBRf worked closely with the Class 50 Alliance, owners of 50007 and 50049, enabling a return to the main line for its locomotives in 2017 and subsequently through a programme of railtours during 2018 as part of the 50th anniversary celebrations of the Class 50s. The decision to repaint the locomotives into the new livery was a recognition of the developing relationship between the two organisations and marked a new chapter in the story of the Class 50s. Over the past few years, GBRf has invested in a programme of driver training to enable Class 50 operation over most of the UK rail network.

The repaints were carried out by Arlington Fleet Services at Eastleigh. The first outing for the GBRf-liveried Class 50s was on Saturday March 23, when they worked Pathfinder Tours' *Teminator-Phoenixed* railtour from London Paddington to Penzance and return to Waterloo. This marked 25 years since the final BR-operated Class 50 railtour over the same route, The Terminator, which was also promoted by Pathfinder.



DAPOL N GAUGE HST-P PRODUCTION SAMPLES PREVIEW



Currently in transit and negotiating shipping and customs, Dapol's Class 41 HST-Ps were expected to arrive at its warehouse as this magazine went to press. Via its YouTube channel, the manufacturer has shared images and a video of one of the models in action.

Models are being produced as separate packs, with power cars available as a twin-pack – one motorised, the other dummy as DMBs 41001 and 41002 in prototype livery, or in departmental livery with full yellow ends as DMBs 975812 and 975813. Additional saloon and buffet packs are available, requiring a power car pack, two saloon packs and a buffet pack to assemble an HST-P set.

ACCURASCALE UNVEILS HYA/IIA COAL/ AGGREGATE HOPPER



Accurascale is to produce models of the HYA/IIA bogie hopper wagon in 00 gauge. The manufacturer has said it has worked on the project between its Class 37, Mk. 5 coaches, Class 92 and "other projects yet to be announced." The wagons are to be made available via the network of Accurascale approved stockists.

The manufacturer has been dealing with tooling backlogs on its Mk. 5 coach and 'Deltic' changes, but started cutting metal on the tooling for the wagons before the pandemic closed down its factories. Samples have been in its possession for a few months.

Photographs of a pre-production sample of the bulky wagons have emerged and Accurascale has been assessing the model with tooling improvements due to be completed in September. The changes include better securing of the cabling along the body side, better fit and finish at the top of the ends of the wagons, and finer renditions of the operating handles.

Accurascale will be offering these wagons in unpainted GBRf with coal branding, unpainted Fastline Freight, unpainted Fastline Freight with GE logos, and unpainted Fastline with Touax logos. A wagon in GBRf guise and one in Fastline livery are to feature a working tail lamp for additional realism to model operations.

Decorated samples of the wagons are due in September and will move into production if they meet approval, with delivery scheduled for Q2, 2021. WH Davis has been instrumental in the development of this project, allowing Accurascale to measure prototypes and providing Accurascale with its own CAD files.

HATTONS GIVES 'GENESIS' PROJECT GREEN LIGHT FOR TOOLING







Hattons Model Railways new 'Genesis' four- and six-wheel coaches have been approved for tooling. The retailer had posted CAD images to our forum, RMweb, allowing prospective purchasers to provide feedback.

At the beginning of the month, the retailer published images and complete CAD files for each of its vehicles to an online viewer for its customers to review. The software allows purchasers to rotate the 3D models and see them from any angle, without needing to download software.

Following feedback from customers, Dave Mylatt, Exclusive Commissions Manager at Hattons, commented "we were aware of a few artifacts on CAD images posted to RMweb. These won't be present on production samples and we're very grateful for the feedback received. With the models now at the tooling stage, we're on track for a delivery in Q1, 2021."

The retailer has begun to reveal final artwork for each livery, starting with LB&SCR mahogany. Hattons has stated it is to release artwork for further liveries over the course of the next month.

The models boast an impressive specification, with six body styles, two detailed underframes, Mansell, three-hole and disc wheel types, and three types of roof furniture (oil or gas lamps, or, electric lights).

Lit and unlit versions of each coach are to be made available, with warm LEDs on lit versions. An 18-pin decoder socket in lit models will permit digital control, though lights are to be powered on when power is applied through the track for analogue users or on digital without a decoder. Coaches are to feature roof-mounted accessories, appropriate to the lighting type for each coach.



HORNBY UNVEILS 'TERRIER' EXCLUSIVE FOR COLLECTORS CLUB

Hornby has unveiled a new model, available exclusively to members of its Collectors Club. Its 0-6-0T 'Terrier' Class locomotive sees the application of Stroudley's improved engine green, embellished with large 'Brighton Works' lettering. The strikingly-liveried locomotive (R3849) served as Brighton Works' showpiece locomotive and first appeared in this guise in June 1947. The locomotive was absorbed into British Railways' stock from January 1948, where it would carry the number 32635 from 1959 until its withdrawal in 1963.

Available to order via the Hornby website, purchasers will need to ensure they are logged-in using their Hornby Collector Club account.

REVOLUTION TO PRODUCE CLASS A TANK AND 'ZANDER' WAGONS



Revolution Trains has unveiled CAD images of its latest models aimed at the steam/diesel transition era modeller – the Class A tanks, which follow on from the company's Class B tankers of 2018. The models are available to order now in a variety of liveries and running numbers.

The Class A tank wagons share an underframe with its already available Class B, but different tooling was required for the longer barrel and different venting and top cap arrangements of the Class A.

In other news, Revolution Trains has received decorated samples of its forthcoming PCV 'Cemflo' cement wagons, being manufactured by Accurascale. Small amendments are to be made, but the manufacturer is anticipating that production of models will commence in Q3. Decorated samples have been approved subject to minor amendments, and Revolution is to close the order book soon for the models to go into production. This model is its third aimed at the 'transition era' modeller, following its Class B tank wagons and 'Sturgeon' track carriers.

CAVALEX MODELS' OO GAUGE TEA FIRST LOOK



Model wagon manufacturing specialist, Cavalex has shared photographs of updated samples of its 4mm:1ft scale (00 gauge) TEA bogie tank wagons. Alex Perkins of Cavalex said "From first inspection, we are very pleased with how the models are looking.

The manufacturer is to now conduct a review of both samples and report changes if required back to the factory, ahead of the arrival of painted samples which will be produced in the next few months. Tooling modifications have been undertaken to allow two versions of TEAs — as built and in their present form. Differences between the two models are the end cap pipework, chassis end plates, and the hazardous information board on the side of the wagon.

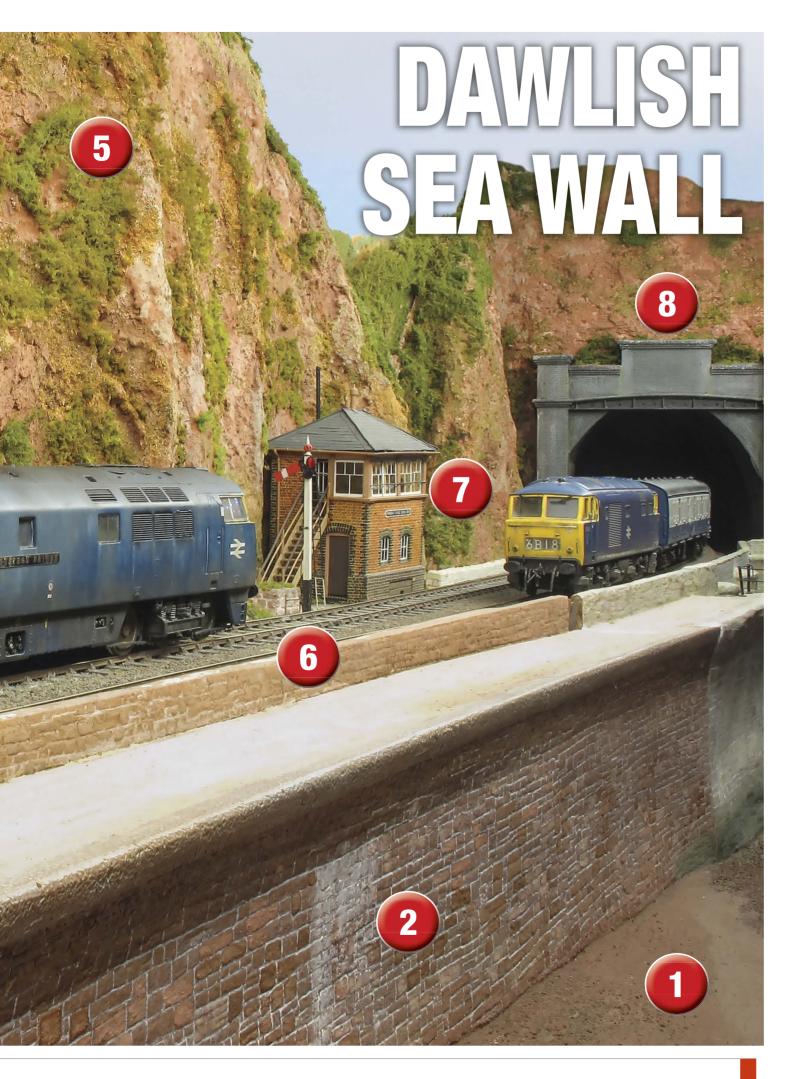
GET THE LOOK

Enter the doors of the fabled Pendon museum in Oxfordshire and it's not the famous vale scene that greets you, but the Dawlish sea wall. Normally, the lines are home to classic GWR steam, but occasionally, Western Region dieselhydraulic motive power enjoys an outing.

If you'd like a piece of South Devon coastline, here are some products to make modelling easier.

- 1 Sand is difficult to model because it's very fine and doesn't scale down easily. Look at soft sands from builders' merchants, or suitably painted plaster. The surface texture isn't so different from 1:76 scale beaches; just make sure you pick the right colour for the area you model.
- 2 For a large stone wall, the obvious choice would be Slater's Plastikard sheets, but nothing in the range is a perfect match for this stone. Wills are closer, but its small sheets would result in lots of joints, all of which would need to be laboriously filled to make them vanish. It's probably quicker to scribe a sheet of cardboard or PVC board from Eileen's Emporium.
- 3 Both locomotives are from Heljan and have been converted to EM gauge using drop-in wheelsets, then extensively weathered. Rail blue faded badly, not helped by the sea's water breaking over the wall during bad weather.
- 4 This cliff is made from plaster, but Woodland Scenics shaper sheet is a more modern and quicker option. Scrunch up, smooth out and stick in place with a thin skim of plaster to add texture. See our tutorial on making a rock face in the 'Techniques' section of www.world-ofrailways.co.uk.
- 5 Cliffs are covered with weeds and small plants clinging to their face. Coarse scatter material pressed into PVA glue replicates this quickly. Just apply it in patches with plenty of gaps.
- 6 Signals are available from Ratio or Dapol. For GWR lines, you need a lower-quadrant signal where the arm points downward for 'off'. Elsewhere, the arm pointed up for 'off' and the design of the post would vary. It's a small detail, but one that sets the location of a model without trains being present.
- 7 Signal boxes varied between railway companies, but for the classic GWR box, your simplest option is the Ratio plastic kit.
- 8 Modelling a distinctive tunnel mouth is difficult, so you might prefer to use a ready-made Peco item, or something cast in stone from Ten Commandments.





Kingsforre - a Phoenix indeed

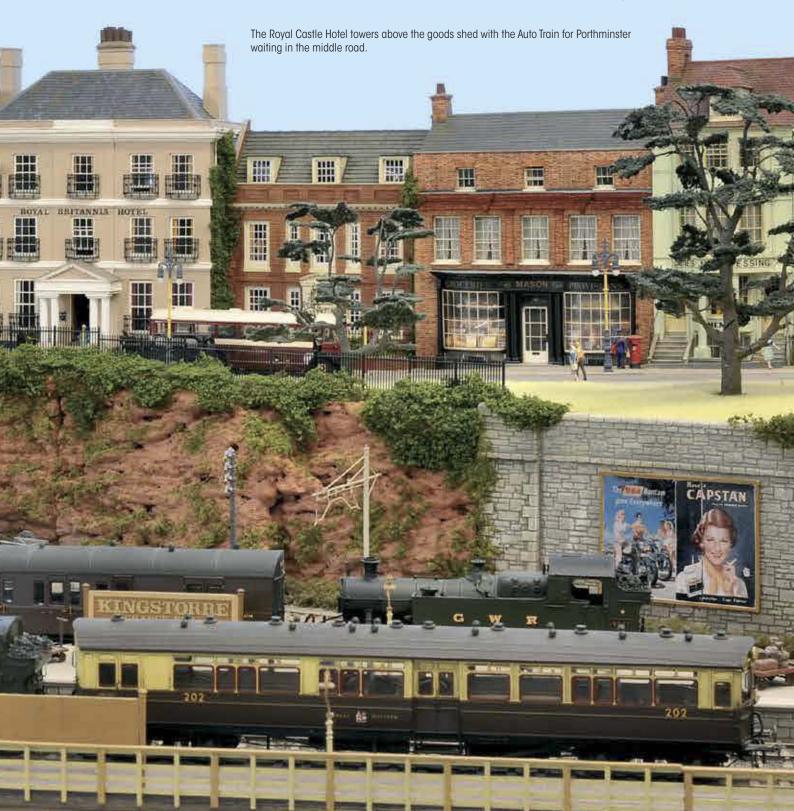
Robert Dudley-Cooke describes his superlative EM gauge recreation of the Great Western main line in South Devon, set just after the war. hmf

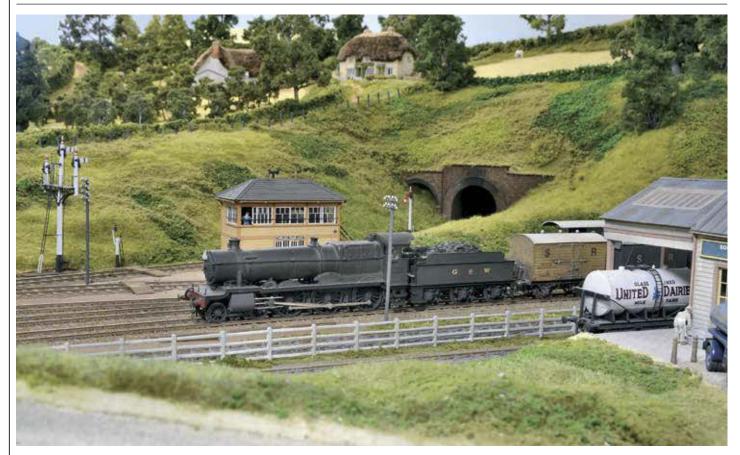
uch has been written and many photographs testify to the magic of the South Devon main line passing through Dawlish and Teignmouth along the sea wall. Few photos exist however of the area between these two towns and of the busy seaside resort of Kingstorre, which came to prominence in Georgian times, and the country station of Porthminster Road where a short branch leads to the town of Porthminster. Many of the photographs accompanying this article illustrate well the workings of the Great Western in the area and the valiant effort the company was making to overcome the effect of the war and the period of austerity that followed.

The town of Kingstorre itself holds an ancient Royal Charter dating back to King Edward VI. The railway when it came, ran right along the sea front in similar fashion to Dawlish, three miles to the east. The town is well known for its Georgian architecture with later Victorian additions and has a small shallow water fishing fleet. From the jetty at the southern end of the town, the local pleasure boat steamer daily takes holiday makers to Torquay and Dartmouth, weather permitting, during the summer months. The town shelters in a protected bay allowing safe bathing and is ideal for family holidays.

The town is centred around Montpellier Square with its gardens, a favoured place for children to feed the ducks and swans. Marine Parade, although a cul-de-sac, has a footbridge just before the tunnel mouth, leading to the Town Quay and the well known local rowing club. A journey up Teignmouth Hill, not to be undertaken lightly - to which the drivers of the Devon General bus will testify - gives the traveller a glance of the coastal path to Teignmouth. The High Street can be viewed to the right of the Ancient Town Hall which spans the river in the town centre.

In the opposite direction, Victoria Road climbs out of the town centre past the entrance to the station, giving a panoramic view of the bay and the red cliffs and a tantalising view of the engine shed. Many of the main line expresses, as well as local

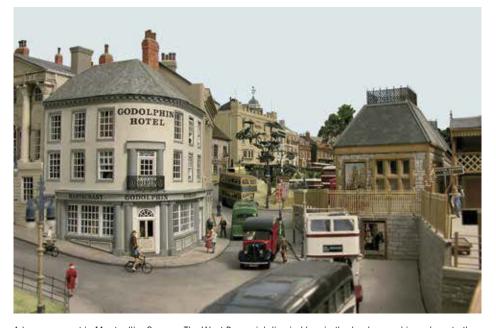
trains, stop at Kingstorre - particularly those emanating from Torquay, with only the Penzance and Plymouth expresses passing non-stop.

The branch from Combe and Okehampton (where it meets the Southern Railway) terminates at Kingstorre and a small engine shed (a sub-shed of Newton Abbot) houses and services the branch engines.

The main line cuts inland through the red cliffs and crosses a small inlet with Harrison's Granary at its head. Porthminster Road is laid out in spacious manner, and here the trains can gather speed on the two through roads, only the local stopping services and the milk trains use the platform loops. Whether or not the hamlet predates the coming of the railway or vice-versa is a moot point, but it proudly boasts a church built of local red stone, a school, a garage and the usual small selection of shops and a farrier. Dawkins the coal merchants serve the local area as does the GWR Goods Shed, which will be shortly the subject of cut-backs with the introduction of the zonal system based on Newton Abbot.

The South Devon Dairies and Creamery has a large depot with private siding, part of the dairy buildings being the old pumping house built by Brunel for his atmospheric railway. The branch to Porthminster itself, a fishing village some two miles inland up the river, is normally operated by the customary 14xx and auto-trailer, but recently trials have begun with a diesel railcar running through Porthminster Road - terminating at Kingstorre to give connection to a greater number of trains.

As the trains leave Porthminster Road eastwards towards Exeter they again plunge

through the red cliffs returning to the seawall and the many tunnels leading to Dawlish itself.

So reads the GWR publicity of the time. The model of this imaginary area started when the first coach was built for the proposed layout in 1969, although in truth had its origins in childhood memories.

Railways or more particularly the GWR and SR railways have always been and remain a core part of my life. There is a picture of me at two years old standing on a

platform gazing up into the cab of a GW loco with child reins on, and my passion for the railway scene and its unifying influence in the landscape have been ever present. For me the locomotive was only part of the interest. It was the totality of the railway environment which was important when I first found, as a very young child, the seawall between Dawlish Warren and Teignmouth in the early 1950s. It had everything I could want, sea, sand, sunshine and above all a busy steam main line skirting the beach

along which proceed a wonderful procession of principally main line expresses going to such exotic sounding places as Penzance at the end of the line.

The structure and design of the layout was, therefore, virtually decided upon at the outset. But lack of a suitably sized room (32' x 25') at the time, and for many years later, meant that all endeavours were put into producing stock and building in excess of 150 hand-built coaches, copious numbers of wagons and over 30 locomotives, none of

which ran sufficiently well to encourage me to have the layout or part of it actually working.

Baseboards were constructed and detailed scenically with the intention that one day they would be joined together to form the layout in its entirety. EM gauge was chosen as a more viable alternative to P4, bearing in mind the size and complexity of the layout envisaged. The track is either set on butyl rubber over a plywood base or 1" (yes 1") cork to give reasonably quiet

running. The first incarnation of the layout was set on insulation board with copperclad track with real granite chippings, set solid in PVA glue. The noise was unacceptable and a lesson was learned.

The necessity was for part of the railway to be set on the sea-wall. The main town was, after much deliberation, to be similar to Dawlish but not that town itself. To copy Dawlish itself in model form would have been too restrictive when it came to architecture and the features I wished to model. The basic layout of Dawlish was followed with the small river running through the centre of the garden square, but the buildings are of an earlier period and design in the main, in accordance with my own tastes. In any event 32' would not have been long enough to effect a scale model of Dawlish.

The second consideration was to have a four-road through country station and the track layout of Totnes (suitably reversed) was chosen and has worked well.

The operation of the trains was to be 'an ordinary weekday in the life of the GWR'- set in June 1947. The full summer timetable would not yet be in operation and being a weekday, trains would also be shorter. However, it would be necessary to have sufficient stock to represent a believable timetable both on the Up and Down main line, hence the enormous stock building programme. The scenic side of the railway was arranged in a 'U' shape using both sides and one end of the railway room and therefore the storage sidings are underneath on one side. This arrangement is not ideal and I would not recommend it. It means that all trains must be pre-formed with a locomotive and stock allocated to each,

and as such is not a true fiddle yard. Access to the sidings is by part removal of boxes of scenery as necessary.

There are in fact 17 Up sidings and 17 Down sidings and in addition there are two branches. The main branch for Kingstorre has five hidden sidings arranged on a turntable and the branch to Porthminster from Porthminster Road, only one.

At the beginning of the 1990s, a house move to take advantage of the residential accommodation of our second school (yes, I'm a school principal), provided an area in the lower ground floor just about large enough to put the sections together, and progress on the entirety of the layout began in earnest. Six or seven years later the trains still were not running and after much heart searching I made two decisions which proved a turning point.

Firstly, I decided to concentrate on one small area, the hamlet of Porthminster Road, and to build this to relative completion instead of working on the entirety of the layout. This then acted as the much needed encouragement to keep going. I could actually see how the layout was going to turn out. I had been greatly influenced by visits to Pendon and the many articles and photographs and I remain deeply indebted to them for the inspiration and in many cases modelling techniques gained over the years.

Secondly, I had to acknowledge that my understanding of matters electrical and mechanical meant in reality that without help I was never going to have the railway running satisfactorily. The ambitious stock building programme necessitated some 40 trains operating for the timetable.

A decision to go DCC brought me into contact with the model maker Neil Kinison and in due course through his endeavours and the introduction of ZTC a few trains began to run after 30 years of building.

Then the unbelievable happened. I received the phone call no one ever wants to receive. I was on my way home in London late on a January afternoon to catch the train to Devon, when my tearful wife rang to say there had been a fire at the school. My first concerns were for the schoolchildren's safety, our daughters, the teachers, the dog and on receiving assurance all was well, asked the question. 'Where was the fire?',

although I knew. 'In the lower ground floor' was the tearful reply. 'Is the railway destroyed?', 'I do not know, it is too dark to see and there is no electric light' was my wife's reply. I arrived home late in the evening and with the aid of a torch scoured the lower ground floor. The house, and school were of course without electricity and it was freezing cold. Everywhere in the lower ground floor was covered with black soot and the acrid smell of smoke was almost too much to tolerate. The fire had started in the main fuse box where the main cable came into the building. It had devoured the school uniforms in the adjoining room to the

railway, the flames by this time starved of oxygen because of the smouldering clothes, had reached only some of the storage sidings. By the time the fire brigade arrived, the fire had reduced to black smoke. The fire brigade most fortuitously made a decision not to use water because the source of the fire was electrical and this decision saved the railway. The scenery of the railway was

therefore intact as far as I could see, although the railway itself, the ceiling, walls and floor were covered in a coating of black soot. Anything plastic had melted or distorted, but the buildings made of card appeared to have superficial damage only and, what's more, had tolerated a considerable degree of heat.

The following morning I was able to

arrange for the insurance assessor and a representative of the electricity board to visit. They immediately ruled out arson, as they concluded I would not have started the fire in this very area. The electricity board admitted responsibility and the assessor accepted that the railway was now worthless and that he would admit a claim up to virtually the full insured value. How could I ever start again? Neil Kinison arrived and it was agreed with the company that we would dismantle the railway, section by section, and send it away to fine art restorers. Fortunately a great deal of the scenery was box sections in the mode of Pendon. The restorers would also do the initial cleaning of the stock.

Corrosion, however, is one of the greatest problems after a fire and gradually everything rusts. It was therefore necessary to completely renew the wheels and electronics.

Stocktaking revealed some 60 hand-built carriages, and a smaller number of goods wagons, were beyond repair and would need to be replaced. A daunting task and I have needed professional help with the rebuilding programme which is still ongoing after eight years, although nearly finished. My thanks go to Peter Dawson who undertook this task and to David Studley for the painting and latterly to Rodney and Vera Cooper of ROCAR. The buildings all survived, but many needed restoration work.

The layout was returned many months later and re-erected temporarily in the school hall,

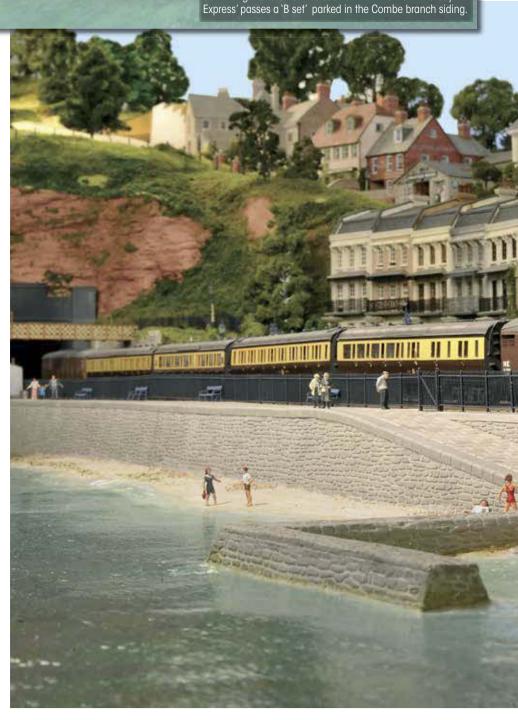
giving access all-round, and the electronics were renewed in short time. The transformation of the scenery to something akin to its original condition was unbelievable. It was necessary, notwithstanding, to renew many of the trees, hedges, and those retained were removed, washed thoroughly and the whole layout was regenerated with Woodland Scatter and the like - the whole process taking several years. The smell of smoke gradually receded and is not now a concern.

A new room houses the railway, to which has been added further scenery on the Porthminster Road side .

The fire did cause me to re-double my efforts and I am pleased to say the layout is now 90% complete, and recently I have actually enjoyed operating the railway without feeling guilty that the time would be better spent working on the modelling side.

The support and help of Neil Kinison has been invaluable with DCC chosen as the most suitable way of operating the trains. We did build in a problem, which we could not remedy at a later time. On the nonscenic end of the railway the Up and Down lines cross and thereafter plunge below. We did not fully realise the extent of the difficulty gradients would bring to the operation and accordingly dropped two levels to the sidings (rather than one) to have better access under the baseboards. This has resulted in the engines needing to be exceedingly heavy for traction purposes with the longer expresses, particularly as hand-built coaches have a considerable weight. On the plus side, we were forced to semi-automate the railway, all routes being pre-set and individual trains called up.

All the principal expresses are modelled, 'The Cornish Riviera', 'Torbay Express' and the 'Devonian' (without headboards proclaiming its name), in both Up and Down directions. There are trains to and from Paddington to Plymouth and Penzance and Torquay, Paignton and Kingswear. In addition, there are the cross-country expresses from Wolverhampton via Stratford, the North to West from Manchester and Liverpool, and the Cardiff and Swansea trains. There is a



short boat train, the super saloons legitimately in pre-war livery, having been stored for the duration of the hostilities. There are parcels trains in each direction, as well as the North Mail - one of those delightful trains providing as many parcels vans as passenger accommodation.

Trains between Bristol, Exeter and Plymouth and the Torbay branch provide the local interest including the daily visit by a Southern Railway locomotive between Exeter and Plymouth. The milk trains play an important part in the daily operation because of the South Devon Dairies' Depot at Porthminster Road.

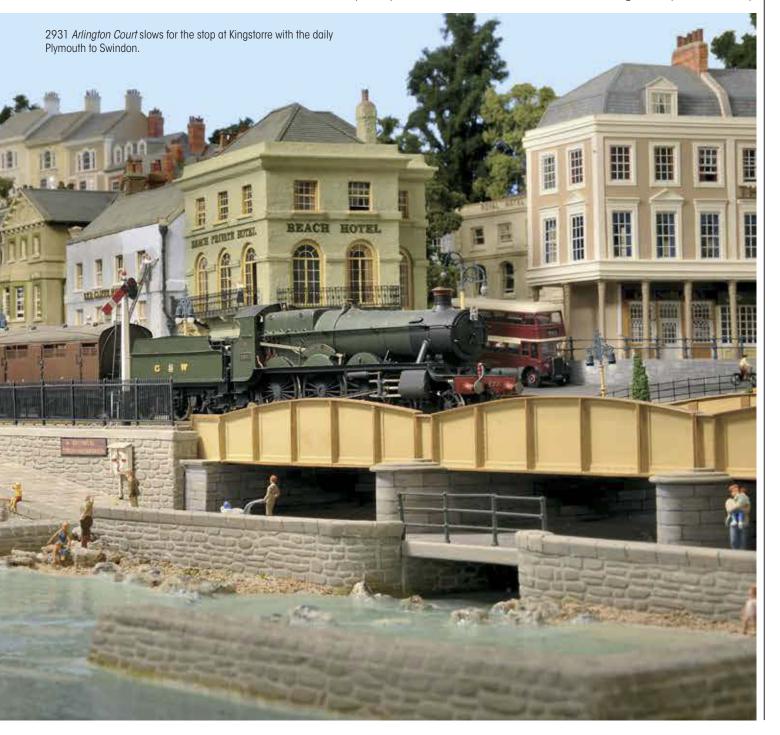
In addition to the usual array of goods and coal trains, there is a train of fish and fruit vans, a train of clay wagons and a ballast train. The branches are operated either by the usual auto-coach, or in the case of the Kingstorre branch by two coach 'B' sets and the occasional foray by a two coach train of SR stock.

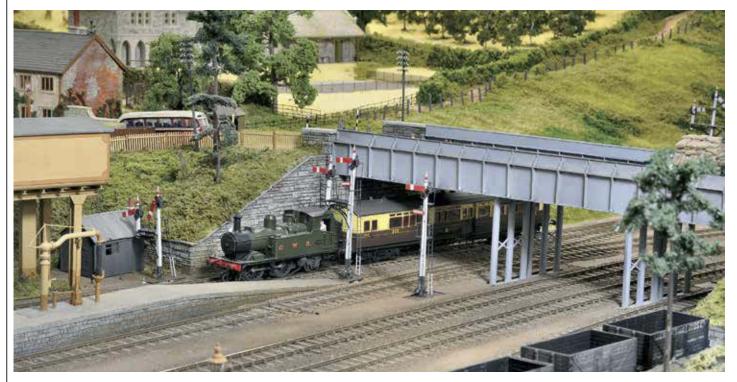
The great majority of locomotives I have built by hand, but they have new compensated chassis (not built by me) and are DCC-fitted - with sound units in most cases. These units really do make a difference. Where there is no room in the locomotive or tender, the first coach or wagon of the rake houses this unit. The process is ongoing.

Without doubt the greatest pleasure I have had is on the architectural side. The buildings are principally made of thin card in similar manner to that formulated and adopted by Pendon. Card somehow gives life to a building and card enables it to take on its own character. I have tried plastic card but it is perhaps too precise, although for certain types of building (ornate plasterwork) the finer detail possible with thin plastic card strips makes it the chosen medium. Card buildings have also been proved to stand up to fire, when their plastic card contempories perished.

Researching buildings for the imagined location and their subsequent modelling have given great satisfaction. Modelling in miniature makes us all very observant of everyday life and I am fortunate in passing on the train the red cliffs of South Devon along the seawall weekly, giving me ample opportunity to examine the scene overall and specific details as needed. I never tire of this scene no matter how many times travelled. There is for me something very satisfying about constructing and detailing buildings and setting them in a believable scene. Coach production too has taken a deal of my time, both in the construction and research, and the types of coaches are as correct as I am able to represent them for

It has always been the totality of the railway scene set in a landscape that is and remains important for me and much, of course, remains to be done. My grateful thanks go to Neil Kinison for his great help and friendship

Transfixed by the GWR's 'Duke' and 'Dukedog' locomotives, Nigel Ashton constructed this finescale paradise for his miniature replicas to roam free.

langerisech is a 2mm finescale (2FS) layout that has been on the exhibition **d** circuit since 2012. In the intervening years, quite a lot developed on the layout and many lessons have been learnt. It is a fictitious location and trackplan set on the Llŷn Peninsula in Wales, with many buildings modelled on real ones in the Cambrian region. The name actually sums up the layout quite nicely. It is an anagram of my two forenames, so is based on elements of reality, but mixed around!

'Llangerisech' was born in a small flat and designed to fit around the outside of the living room. The available shape dictated the plan and I adapted the trackplan of Trezeath from a magazine article sometime in 2000.

The baseboards were made to be transportable, being constructed from 9mm ply as four inverted boxes, each 4ft long. Two subsequent house moves had the luxury of putting the layout into bespoke hobby rooms, but it still fits around the outside neatly.

On tour

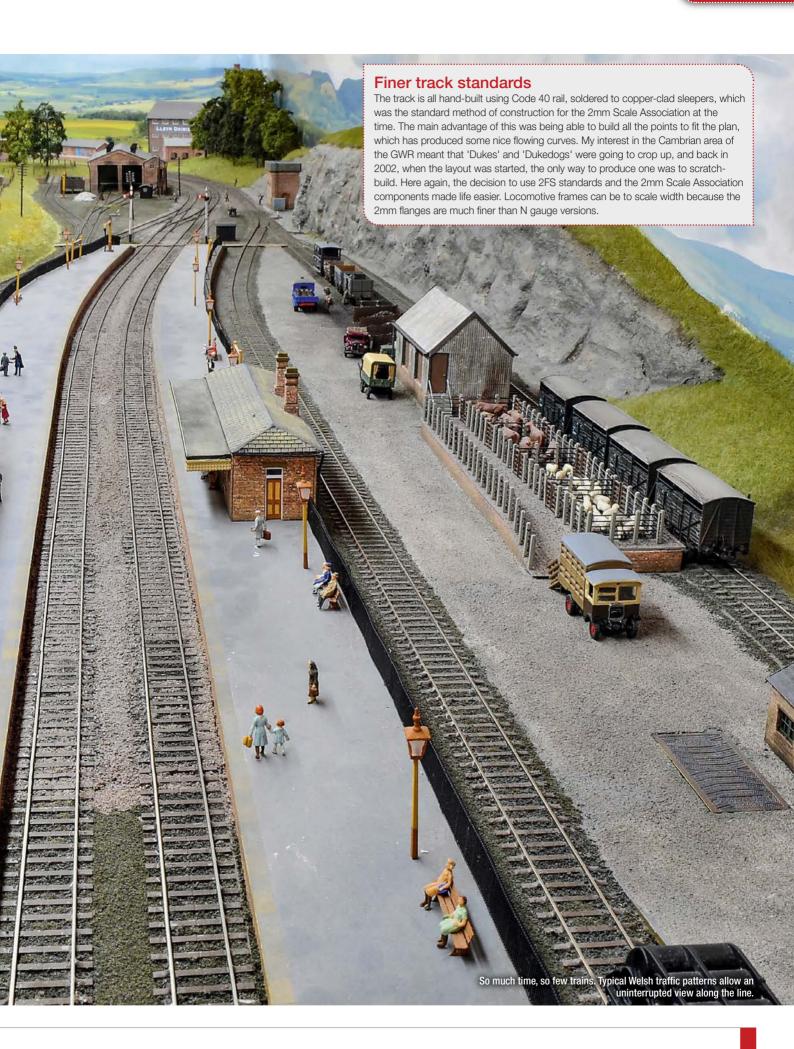
Exhibiting the layout has been good fun, if a little stressful at first. Once everything was reliable, I could actually enjoy the process and chat with visitors while others did the operating. With so much being hand-built, questions always arise about techniques and sources of items.

At shows, it is always gratifying to see people's reactions to things like the reins on the horse-drawn vehicles or the rhubarb and bean plants in the allotments. While we try to entertain visitors by keeping things moving at a reasonable pace, short breaks encourage examination of the modelling away from the trains. After all, it is mid-Wales and nothing should be rushed!

We run to a repeating sequence with different trains, so whenever a team member has a break, it is easy to spot where we are and pick up the controller with confidence upon returning to duty. The fiddle yard operator decides what runs, and the drivers know what to do. Few visitors seem to get bored with the cycle and frequent use of the turntable provides ample entertainment.

When transporting to exhibitions, the boards are paired up with end plates to make two boxes that protect the scenic areas. Legs were originally bolted to the underside of the boards, but after helping exhibit other layouts, I changed to pockets,

which allow the legs to slot in – so much quicker to set up and takedown. However, so many other bits and pieces have been added since, that the time saved here is less significant.

Control systems

Initially the layout was wired for DC, working with about 20 sections, but I changed to DCC around 2004 because chip sizes were just about small enough to fit into the locomotives. At the Chatham show one year, I was talking to Dave Nicholson, who suggested using the bolts holding the boards together to take the bus bar connections.

By using stationary decoders, this has reduced the wiring hugely and means a very reliable layout has resulted.

At home, the layout is operated from the inside of the 'L', while at shows, we operate from the back of the layout by bolting on the control panel at different points, all connected to the bus. I have used different decoders for different purposes with Team Digital items for points, Lenz for uncoupling units and Megapoints for the signals. The main control uses a Digitrax Zephyr unit and a few UT5 throttles along with a CML electronics board built into the mimic panel.

Off-scene

An area that generates a lot of interest and questions at exhibitions is the arrangement of the fiddle yard. While a traverser worked well at first with diesels, when turning steam locomotives, it got rather cumbersome, so a change was made to cassettes. These are made with aluminium angle strip of 13mm section, glued to 18mm thick MDF bases with a 'No Nails'-type adhesive. We have separate locomotive cassettes and train cassettes, which allow the locomotives to be turned, independently. Adding permanent magnets at one end of the train cassette allows uncoupling to be simple, while an



LED on the locomotive cassette shows that power is there. If the LED isn't lit, the usual remedy is a small wiggle of the cassette in the socket. Crocodile clips are available as a back-up, but are rarely required as the contact is made by the cassettes themselves.

Scenery and buildings

I feel that the aspect that gives the layout a sense of place in the Cambrian region is the buildings. All except the corner dairy/ factory are based on real counterparts, the highlight being the main station building from Llanidloes. There is a family connection as I had ancestors in the town several generations back.

The building uses multiple layers of thin card, cut using a CraftRobo machine, along with Scalescenes brick paper and York Modelmaking roof tiles. There is a thicker card skeleton to provide the core strength. I obtained plans when part of the building was available to let as offices and details appeared in a letting agent website, along with several pictures. Other historical pictures helped me put a complete unit together and the reaction at shows is always good – including praise from a few people who actually work in the real place. You can stand on a footbridge and get the same view

of the station building in reality, even now.

Other items include the engine shed from Llanidloes, the goods shed from Llandre, a signal box modified from the one at Carrog, and even the cliff face from Machynlleth.

Many questions

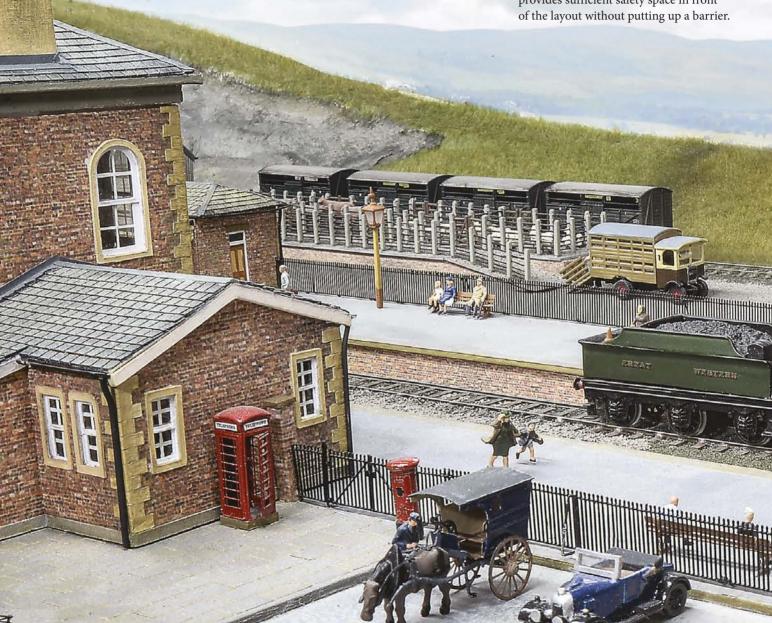
Many of the questions being asked at shows tended to be the same. "Where is it supposed to be?" or "Where did that come from?" A decision to display some of the basic answers was made and a couple of small plinths attracted interest, so I then added a screen running a PowerPoint slideshow. The problem with this was

that when a question was asked, the slide answering it had just gone past! We also found younger visitors swiping the screen, expecting it to change, but it was an old spare screen and not touch-sensitive (one way to make you feel old is watching tech go obsolete!). So, full length plinths with lots of info replaced the lot and worked really well. This adds another level of interest and provides sufficient safety space in front



Stock and motive power

Starting in any bespoke scale is a bit chicken and egg with regards to track and stock, so I converted some blue diesels and stock from N gauge to allow the layout to develop while I built the 1930s GWR stock. As a child growing up in the 1970s, this was mainly nostalgia-driven, but it did have a practical side. The first few shows used the 1970s stock as we found our feet.

However, I had conceived the layout as 1930s GWR and a lot of scratch-built stock is what tends to set the layout apart. The first locomotive built was Tre Pol and Pen, the progenitor of the 'Dukedog' Class, although the real locomotive was always classed as a 'Duke'. Subsequently, I bought a small milling machine and devised a method of building split chassis from solid brass. These milled chassis went under the 'Jones Goods', the 'Dean Goods', the small 'Prairie' and 'Collett Goods' in different configurations. The conversion to the Ixion Manor ended up being produced by Alan Smith and we sold around 50 chassis - some even ending up in New Zealand! The kit is still available to 2mm Scale Association members via the shops.

Questions still arise, but they tend to be more individual in nature and, of course, we are still happy to answer them.

What's next?

The one thing that a terminus demands is concentration and coordination. It is interesting to operate, but to keep up a decent level of activity requires several operators. This is one reason why my new layout is a through station, which will halve the staffing levels.

'Llangerisech' has been invited to several shows over the past eight years with most of my 'bucket list' being ticked off. The plan now is to move on to the prototypebased 'Drws-y-Nant' for shows and keep 'Llangerisech' as the home layout. Apart from maintaining the level of pronunciation difficulty, the new layout will include many of the lessons learnt with 'Llangerisech'. All the stock can still be used and I look

forward to using a lot more of the goods stock. I have made use of many of the new items available to 2mm Association members, which weren't available when I started 'Llangerisech'. These include the Easitrac sleeper base, etched chair plates to match this on PCB for turnouts, and point rodding etches. By using trestles and beams for a sub-structure, the boards are lighter and much quicker to erect than the monocoque approach of 'Llangerisech'.

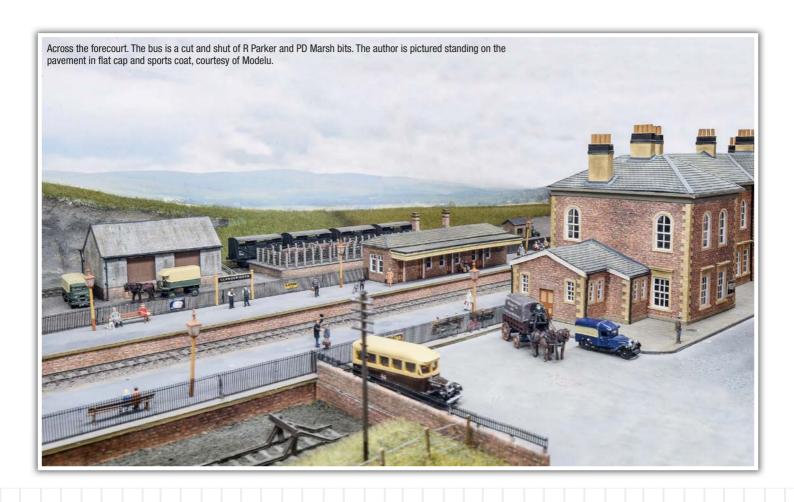
Having been made welcome into the 2mm Scale Association in the early days, I'm now on the committee, hopefully giving something back. The hobby is so wideranging, there is no right or wrong, but many ways of doing things and you never stop learning from others. While building the layout, many items have been re-worked to improve them. The beauty of scratchbuilding is that if you make a mistake, it is only another bit of brass or cardboard gone to waste. You also learn better ways of producing things to a higher standard, so the time making the mistake is never wasted.

Thanks must go to the numerous 2mm Scale Association members who have helped with exhibiting, and my wife Helen for tolerating the occasional use of the dining room when there is no space left in the railway room! Thanks too, to Tony Wright for his enthusiasm while taking the excellent photographs. I hope that a couple prove of interest, even when there are no trains in sight – just like the real thing!

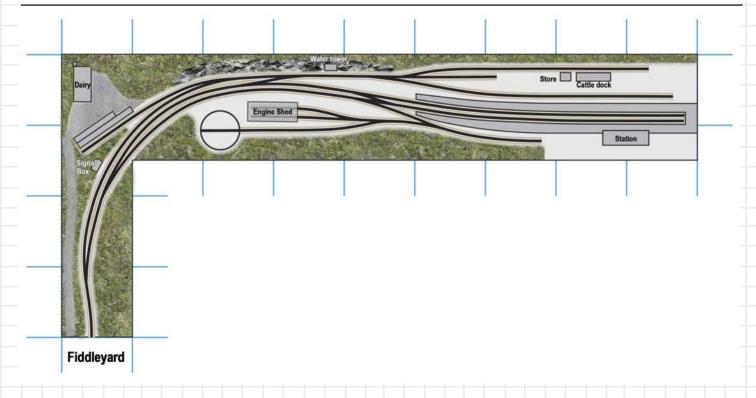

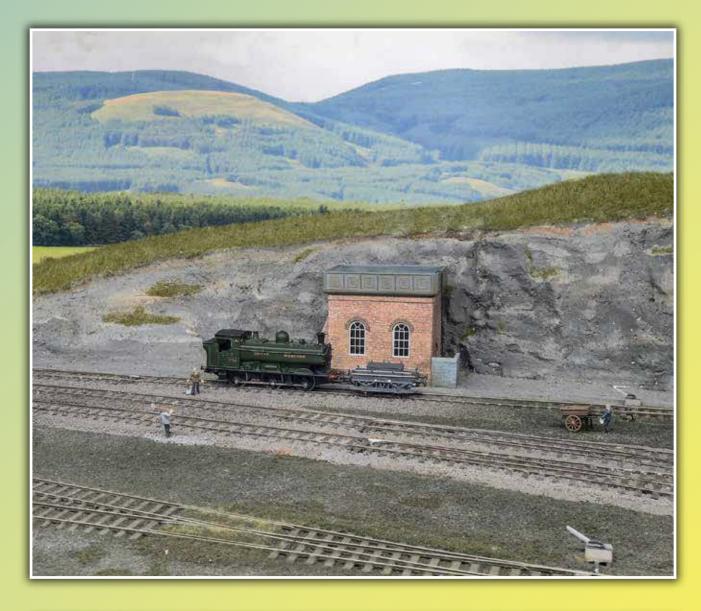
Trackplan LLANGERISECH

HOW TO... ADAPT HORNBY'S SALT PGA WAGONS

When a model isn't available in kit form, or produced by manufacturers, a similar RTR wagon is a good base for heavy modifications, as Michael Russell elaborates.



ometimes when modelling a specific location, you need items that aren't available off-the-shelf or in kit form. This is where more advanced modelling skills are required because you either have to scratch-build or adapt existing products. The bulk salt wagons required for the BRM 'Runcorn Salt Union' project layout are a good example - nothing is available RTR.

For this project, the starting point is the Hornby (ex-Lima) PGA stone wagons, which are adapted to make Procor 51T PGAs. Some lengthening is required and the wheels, end platforms, couplings, ribbing and buffers all need attention.

There are three ways of making the wagons. You can use fewer cuts to make one wagon out of two, although this is wasteful of material. You can also make three wagons out of four, if you retain the centre hopper divider of the Hornby models. However, I have chosen to make two wagons out of three, by removing the centre hopper divider and replacing it with a piece of plain hopper from a donor, extending the body at the same time.

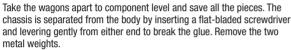
Batch building

Adam Smith was the first to employ the principle of the division of labour when making pins. The idea is that rather than one person making a complete pin from start to finish, the process is divided into discrete stages in which each person can specialise. Pins are passed down the assembly line, with each stage forming an element until the finished pin is produced by the last person in the chain. Such ways of working greatly increase productivity.

You may be building the wagons on your own. However, there are still significant advantages to building in this way. However, I wouldn't employ this way of working if building something new with an unknown process, or if I were unsure of the build order. In both scenarios, I'd build a complete unit from start to finish to prove the concepts involved, then apply batch building techniques for the remainder of

Preparation







Use Phoenix Precision Superstrip to remove the paint from the models by immersion. Ensure that you observe all the health and safety advice on the website. Leave the model in the mixture only for the minimum time required to strip the paint.

Lengthening the bodies



The bodies are cut to remove the divider from one hopper, replacing this with a plain hopper section from another wagon. The body needs to be 8mm longer than



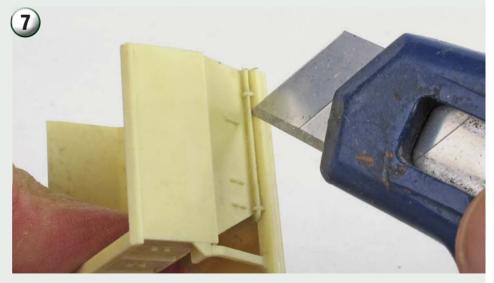
Remove mounting lugs from the bottom of the donor section and ensure all cut ends are square. You may have to spend time filing the surfaces so they mate together



Cut the hopper divider section so that 10mm of material is removed. Cut the other two pieces to be 18mm long, so that you get the length correct when they are spliced into position.



The wagon bodies were too tall for my mitre box, so I made a jig from timber to start the cuts off. Swap to a mitre box as soon as the cut is of sufficient depth.



Cut and file off all traces of pipework from the outside of the hoppers. Use a rotary tool with a router bit for the hopper ends, ensuring that you wear eye protection.

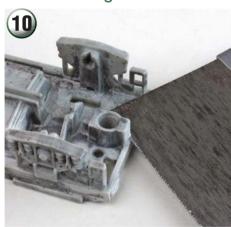


Glue the hopper pieces together using Poly Cement and clamp the sides so that they are straight. Work on a flat surface to keep the body aligned correctly.



You will have to do some filling. I used Finescale Model World Master Prime and its Modellers Prep-Set. It is not easy to achieve a perfect finish on a shape like this, especially at the hopper ends where the access is limited.

Chassis changes



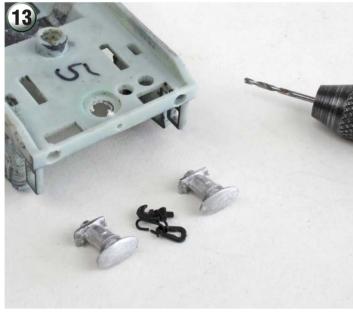
Use a razor saw to remove the coupling housing and the buffers, being careful not to damage the steps. File the buffer beam flat and smooth.



Cut a chassis into three parts and place on a lengthened, inverted hopper. Cut out two pieces from a second chassis to fill in the two gaps. Glue together, ensuring you don't stick the chassis to the body.



Drill and cut out the plastic surrounding the discharge mechanisms. Be careful as these are delicate items and are easy to break. This is worth doing as it makes a big improvement to the appearance.



Mark out and drill holes in the buffer beams for the buffers and couplings. Tidy the buffers with a file to remove seam lines.



The brake wheels are in a higher position than the stone PGAs. Drill the new location $\,$ and fit a piece of 0.060in plastic rod ready to take the wheel after painting. Fill in the old location with filler.

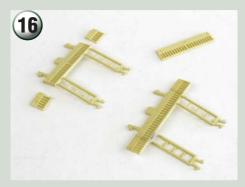
Body detail



Cut away the platforms ends moulded into the body. The existing platforms are extended to fit into the space created.



Add the ribbing at the end of each body using Plastruct 1.2mm angle. You will need three pieces for each end and they should line up with the existing ribbing.



Remove the handrails from the end platforms. Use one platform as a donor by cutting it into four and using these pieces to extend the other two platforms.



Glue a piece of 0.75mm x 1mm plastic square along the top of each wagon body side, positioned just below the bevel. Mark out the five places on the body for the external ribbing.



Glue the original handrails in their new position. Use 0.5mm square styrene to make new centre handrails to match the height of the other handrails and to fit into the space between the ladders.



Add the Plastruct angle on the body sides. You will need to file a notch about 2mm from the end of each lower piece to cover the change in the body side profile.



Cut small 3mm x 1mm right-angled triangles to fit at the bottom of each rib using 0.25mm x 1mm styrene strip. Glue in place with Poly cement.



Cut 0.8mm plastic sheet the same width as the internal wagon hopper. Then, cut the four stepped shapes out for the top ribbing. They need to be 4mm tall. Glue two back-to-back and file the square profile round.

PRACTICAL BRM



Mark the position of the top cover ribs on the inside of the wagon hopper. There are four and they are equally spaced. Be sure that these are upright when you glue them in place.



Make triangular pieces to cover the wagon ends from 0.020in styrene sheet. Glue in place and file flat with the wagon sides once the glue has set.



Take measurements from a wagon and draw a simple template on paper to make the piping. Use 0.020in plastic rod and employ the same material as spacers between the pieces, mounted on pieces of 4mm square 0.020in plastic sheet.



Glue the pipe assemblies to the mounting pads. You can also glue the piping to the ribs for extra strength, taping them in place to ensure consistent spacing until dry. Add 4mm square covers made from 0.020in styrene sheet.



Using the same profile as the top ribs, cut 0.8mm styrene sheet to make the wagon ends. Use 2mm half round styrene to form the edging.



Cut the saved end components in two and remount them on the wagon ends. They need to go back on the same ends they originally came from. Fill in the holes from the old mounting positions with rod and filler.



Glue the ends in place. Make new hopper edging from 0.020in styrene sheet, 3mm deep. It is best to measure each wagon individually to take account of variance from the cut and shut process.



Make 4mm square mounting pad pieces from 0.8mm styrene sheet. Glue a piece along one edge from the same material so that the pieces lie parallel to the solebars when glued.

HOW TO... RESTORE AN AIRBRUSH

Damaging a top-of-the-line airbrush can prove a costly mistake, as Howard Smith shares with the repair and restoration of his Iwata Custom Micron.



f you class yourself as an 'active' modeller - and by that, I mean you're adapting models, or constructing kits, even if just occasionally, rather than collecting - you'll have a set of modelling tools. With use, I find there's a 'go-to' set of tools. These are the ones frequently used because they perform a task better than the rest, or fit in the hand better. Unsurprisingly, they're always in arm's reach, not buried under a pile of leftover bits, or worse, left in a drawer or toolbox as bought. Rarely are they damaged, however. Drop a pair of tin snips from the modelling bench and it's likely your

feet will suffer most! As ever though, there are exceptions.

When airbrushing the track for our project layout 'Runcorn Salt Union' outside during lockdown this summer, my foot was caught in the airline when manoeuvring a baseboard, sending my favourite airbrush into a 4ft free-fall from its stand to the hard paving. Of all outcomes, the airbrush landed nozzle first with pretty harsh results.

Disheartened, I knew it was broken, but to what extent? And, more importantly, could it be repaired? I hoped so - its like-for-like replacement carries an RRP of £469.00!





The damage is localised to the airbrush fluid head system. Unfortunately, this is the most critical part, and the most delicate. Small imperfections to it have a large impact on the spraying qualities. The head nozzle cap thread is visibly bent beyond repair.



Behind the head nozzle cap sits the head nozzle and tip of the needle. Both are damaged, the needle being bent through 180 degrees, making it impossible to remove and testament to the force of the impact. It requires gentle straightening with pliers before removal



Parts now unscrew, as with most high-quality airbrushes. To remove the nozzle, I use a spanner tool that is provided with the airbrush. Unless you're familiar with the airbrush, take a mental, or written note of where parts fit for later.

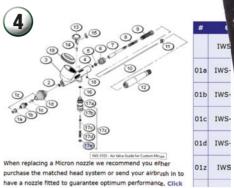


Only the tip of the needle is bent, so I'm keen to see if it can be repaired, using a SharpenAir tool, also retailed by The Airbrush Company. It restores airbrush needles from all brands - except those from Paashe and DeVilbiss - to their factory angle.



Needle restored! The SharpenAir tool costs more than a replacement needle, so should be seen as an investment. How many times you use it depends on how clumsy you are with an airbrush, but for the professional painter, if spares aren't available in time, it's very useful

Iwata Custom Micron CM-C - Parts



lwata is a popular brand of high-quality airbrushes, so spares are readily available from good stockists. Handily, an interactive parts list on The Airbrush Company website ensures fast identification, removing the guesswork.



The four-step process starts from the right, each hole in the tool having a diamond grit-coated sharpening stone, set to the correct angle at the base. Rotate the needle until it is evenly ground, working from the coarse stones to the finer ones. A pin vice helps.



Sadly, the nozzle isn't salvageable, so this, along with the head cap, is replaced after cleaning the airbrush thoroughly with a solvent cleaning fluid that won't damage the seals. Budget airbrushes often have seals that don't last long, especially when exposed to solvents. The order placed, a new head system and replacement needle are received. The head system retails at £173.59, the needle at £26.60. This isn't a cheap repair, but it must be right and it's more cost-effective than a new custom lwata airbrush. The new needle might not be required, however...

Top tip: spare parts

With regular use, airbrush components wear. Unless you damage it first, it's the seals that are often replaced. Spares often aren't available for budget airbrushes because they're considered as being disposable,

but a quality airbrush like this should last years.





The airbrush is adjusted, its seals are lubricated, tested, and everything works as it should - a relief knowing the cost of the parts replaced! Lesson learned not to remove the crown cap when not airbrushing and to double check footing when around the air line!

CONVERTING HELJAN'S CLASS 45

The hefty 1-Co-Co-1 'Peaks' have always been a favourite of mine and I can remember the anticipation as a small boy when Mainline first announced its OO gauge model many years ago. I was enticed by Heljan's 7mm scale version, which captures the look of these locomotives well. Heljan's model represents a Class 45 with twin centre headcode panels. While some provision is made for variations such as plated-over footsteps and side grilles, it is fundamentally as modified in the late-1960s, with air brake tanks under the centre batteries, multiple working equipment removed and the later-style nose side grilles.

I had originally intended to change one of these models to 'as-built', with blue star multiple-working jumpers and perhaps later convert a spare body to a Class 46 with centre headcode in blue. I came across a good photograph of Class 46 D148 in relatively new condition at Birmingham New Street, where I would hope to see one while passing through on the way to my grandparents. I decided to model that

Aside from having Brush traction motors rather than the Crompton Parkinson type as fitted to Class 45s, the visible differences of the Class 46s were different style battery box covers, one additional panel on the roof behind the main fan, and the absence of a small access cover under the long grille on one side. While Class 46s are often associated with the single one-piece headcode panel, in fact, headcode styles and visible or plated-over side grilles varied by batch and period, rather than by Class. As ever, a good photograph is essential.

The side grilles are not a critical part of the locomotive's character for me, so I left them as modelled. With the work done, I spent a lot of time on the finish. I used 2000 grade wet and dry in a circular motion to very gently flat down the factory paint finish to a smooth pit-free surface, then gently buffed it using kitchen roll and the merest hint of T-cut. This gives a nice sheen on the flat surfaces with a rougher texture in the hard to access bits - precisely where dirt would accumulate. After numbering and sealing the individual digits, I added a wash of (Humbrol 32) dirty grey with a hint of brown enamels. This was mostly wiped off with kitchen roll and cotton buds. A further light buffing created the appearance of work staining on relatively new paint that I was trying to capture. Roof grime was applied and largely removed, and exhaust soot was stippled on with the brush almost dry and built up slowly. Skilled use of an airbrush would be an advantage here - something I keep meaning to learn.

Apart from the repainting, this was a relatively easy project, but one that adds a satisfying personal stamp to a proprietary locomotive.

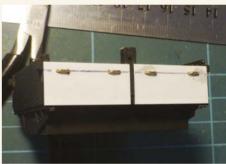




I started with the bufferbeams, detaching them from the bogies and using Heljan Class 40 spare parts for the extra cables, mounted on styrene off-cuts. I wasn't to know it at the time, but getting the coupling hooks back on proved to be the hardest part of the project. Such is the weight of the locomotive, I think it would be difficult to do the work in situ.



The roof panel was made to match the style of the others but went missing and, after a fruitless search, had to be replaced. The mystery was only solved many months later when it surfaced nestling inside the box for my model filler!



Having removed all the central air brake tanks, new battery box covers were easily fashioned from thin styrene with wire handles, estimating dimensions relative to the adjacent sand boxes. There is a small valve or tap on the flat panel under the batteries.



The unwanted side panel was gently rubbed down using ultra-fine wet and dry, but, despite care, it was obvious I would need to patch the paintwork. I tried a range of Precision Paints BR and GWR greens on a test card. The correct diesel era green was the best match and it was as near identical as I could have wished for. I brush-painted with a flat brush in one stroke, with little more than a wash, flatting off with the same fine wet and dry. Once weathered, it doesn't show.

Thanks for another interesting **BRM** and September video. I was pleased to see your item on a layout vehicle - an area sadly neglected, even on many fine layouts. You asked for examples of weathered vehicles, so here's my EFE model that goes to the extreme. It's an ex-London Transport STL, which was purchased second-hand by Bere Regis and District Motors. The company never operated the bus in service and simply used it for spares - mainly engine and radiator. I've given the impression of deflated wheels by filing the bottom off the current wheels and adding filler to the bottom of the wheel sides.



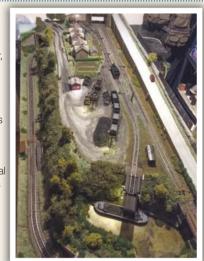


THIRD GENERATION

I've been modelling for 18 months and built this layout with, and for, my young grandson, based in the Leeds area, circa 1959. It uses a Tri-ang Hornby working tipper set that deposits real coal into the waiting barge on the Leeds Liverpool Canal. The layout is a work in progress and we are planning a coal loading diorama that will be accessible through the fiddle yard so we don't have to load wagons

The wagons shown are all we have, so more would expand our shunting options. The photograph shows the lower running line, which uses Tri-ang series 3 track and super 4 points to an additional fiddle yard. We can run my old stock from the late 1950s, my son's old stock from the 1970s and my grandson's new stock, which is mainly Hornby with TTS sound. We can run DC or DCC on both levels, or DCC on one and DCC on the other.

A CALEDONIAN 'CLAYTON'

I really like the Class 17 'Clayton', and with a strong fondness for the Caledonian Railway, I wanted to repaint a model into a new style of Caledonian livery for my fictitious 1963-era lavout.

The model had to be stripped down to its bare shell and the buffers were removed before the body could be separated from the chassis. The body came off the chassis easily, and the cab also came off the body with a little manipulation. Glazing and wipers were removed, leaving little in the way of cab detail. I found it easier to remove the lighting units from the inside, rather than trying to mask off the lights from the outside. Bufferbeam fittings can be removed with care.

The factory-applied decals were gently rubbed with a fine fibreglass pencil to take them off. I used 2500 grit sandpaper for a

good finish. Parts were primed with Halfords grey primer, but white primer was used for the ends because the yellow paint doesn't cover the grey primer so well. The yellow ends were masked before a top coat of gloss black was applied. I left a day between coats of paint.

The ornate style of the old Caledonian would have been deemed to be too expensive for my later-era layout. I used a Bob Moore lining pen with a fine nib, and the locomotive number came from a sheet of rub-down transfers. A coat of matt varnish sealed the lining and transfers. After a test run, I re-fitted the buffers. The bogies, fuel tank and underframe fittings were given a brush of matt varnish before applying a light coat of weathering powder.

DURHAM STREET

Can a successful layout concept leave room for improvement? Ian Harper and his fellow club members believed so, changing to a larger scale in the process.

y interest in model railways started around 1953, when my father bought me a Hornby-Dublo train set. In the late 1950s early-'60s, I spent most of my time trainspotting, most of which I did at York. I was lucky enough to have a father who was an avid amateur photographer and he would lend me his camera, enabling me to take photographs of the trains.

I am a founder member of the Scarborough & District Railway Modellers, which was formed in 1978, and it has been here at the club that my desire in building exhibition layouts started.

'Durham Street' is the club's first O gauge layout and is based on the success of the previous OO gauge exhibition layout, 'Haymarket Cross'.

The era modelled was based on my memories of trainspotting in the early-1960s, when I spent many days on York Station watching the comings and goings of the trains. I also spent time at Doncaster and Northallerton where you had the chance of seeing the trains passing at speed. I still have my 'spotting books' and many photographs taken at the time, so it was easy to copy into 'Durham Street'. Thanks to my records, it's been easy to recreate what I saw at the time, even down to the correct shedplates!

The design of 'Durham Street' depicts how the older steam sheds were having to accommodate the new diesels, particularly with having to add a fuelling depot. The Greenwood Model's turntable is still in use, turning the steam locomotives, and is a unique way of accessing the ash pit, saving space.

Permanent way

The track used is by C&L Finescale and the points are hand-built from C&L kits. Point operation is by Circuitron's Tortoise point motors, whose built-in switches power the point frogs.

With C&L track, you are able to make points to any size and shape you need. When we started to build the points, it was quite daunting. However, once we got going, it became easier to do as we were able to follow what we had done previously. It also helped to rectify any problems we had encountered.

Once the track was laid, it was ballasted using Woodland Scenics OO scale ballast. This was held in place with the usual mix of 50:50 PVA glue and water. The ballast was first sprayed with a water and washing up liquid mix. Once dry, I airbrushed the track







with Precision Paints track grime, applying a couple of coats. I also airbrushed a few areas with dirty black where locomotives would normally stand. We also added weathering powders in some areas.

DCC Control is by Digitrax. With 20 or so locomotives on the layout at any one time, we've added a booster to ensure adequate power is available for the often powerhungry O gauge locomotives.

Point motors are controlled by Digitrax's DS64s. Sig-naTrak DTM30s allows the points to be changed from the panels and/ or the handsets, while at all times showing the exact settings on the individual handsets and by LED lighting on the panels. If a point is changed, both panels and all handsets register the change.

Power to the layout is divided into subdistricts by Digitrax's PM42s. These devices protect the command station and booster from shutting down if a short-circuit occurs anywhere on the layout. Most short-circuits are down to operator error, for example, driving a locomotive onto wrongly set

points. With these units, only the affected sub-district shuts down and the rest of the layout stays operational. We feel this is essential for an exhibition layout. Once the short has been rectified, the PM42s automatically restore power. Often visitors don't even notice our mistakes!

The turntable was made by Mike Green of Greenwood Models and came as a complete unit. It includes a control panel for easy setup and operation. It will also work digitally, which is something we are working

on. Mike sends complete instructions for fitting it and we made sure all the incoming tracks lined up correctly both track-wise and height-wise.

Exhibiting

'Haymarket Cross' was a layout where you had to work out your locomotive movements – it wasn't a straightforward 'in and out' layout. We had a team of between four and six people running it and they had to work together arranging locomotive movements in and out of the shed.

With this in mind, we have tried to incorporate a similar system on 'Durham Street'. We don't have the same number of locomotives, but operators have to work together when running in or out of the shed. One of the best things about 'Haymarket Cross' was the constant movement of rolling stock, which the public at shows loved. We have moved forward with 'Durham Street' by adding front of layout operation as well as to the back. This is popular with the public



because we can interact while running locomotives. We also encourage youngsters to have a go at controlling the locomotives.

MPD fleet

All locomotives (including examples of A4s, A3s, A2s and A1s, 'Britannias', 9Fs, V2s, B1s, B16s, V3s, N2s, J72s, 5MTs, J50s, 'Deltics', 37s, 31s, 20s and 08s) are sound-equipped by Loksound or Zimo decoders. Models are from Finescale Brass/55H, Loveless, Heljan, Dapol, Gladiator and DJH kits. All

locomotives are prototypical for the era and region. Coal wagons supply the coaling stage and oil tankers service the new diesel depot.

Unlike 'Haymarket Cross', where we had around 70 locomotives on shed, 'Durham Street' only boasts around 20. Of course, that doesn't matter as the locomotives are considerably larger. Most of the stock is based on BR (ER/NER) in the early-1960s.

My favourite locomotives are the A4s, A2s and 'Britannias', although I have a soft spot for the B16, which is a Gladiator kit-built locomotive that depicts the one that was shedded at Scarborough in the 1950s and 1960s. My late father-in-law was a driver at Scarborough and would have regularly driven it. Most have been weathered, although there are one or two I just can't bring myself to do as I like to keep them in ex-works condition – a bit of modeller's licence! They're all sound-fitted, the majority with Zimo decoders for OO models, but the bigger locomotives are fitted with Zimo MX699KS O gauge units. I have

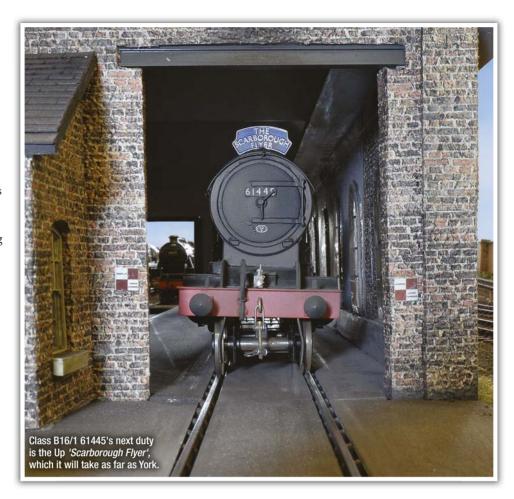
recently been fitting the OO gauge ones with TCS 'Keep Alive' units. These units are fantastic, giving locomotives a constant power supply of around 12 seconds over dirty or problematic track.

Creating the scene

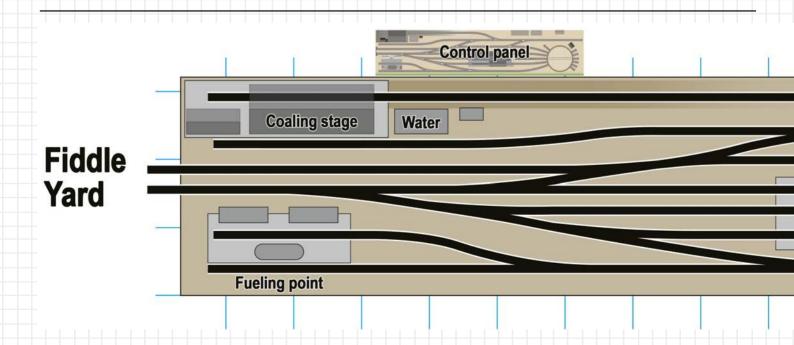
Buildings are all scratch-built, based on North Eastern designs from the era, using Foamex and embossed brick paper. We used railway books with photographs of buildings and locomotive sheds to research how they may have looked. Windows are laser-cut from York Model Making. Yard and building lighting is by RMLectronics.

In terms of scenery, there's a lot of dirty ballast, many oil spills, and scattered ash. Mod Roc was used to shape the ground, and some grassy areas still survive! Figures are 3D-printed by Hardy's Hobbies and handpainted by our layout team.

At the moment, we don't have plans to build another layout, mainly due to not having enough space in the clubroom. We are working on a few members' layouts, which can be brought to the club and then taken home after work is completed.

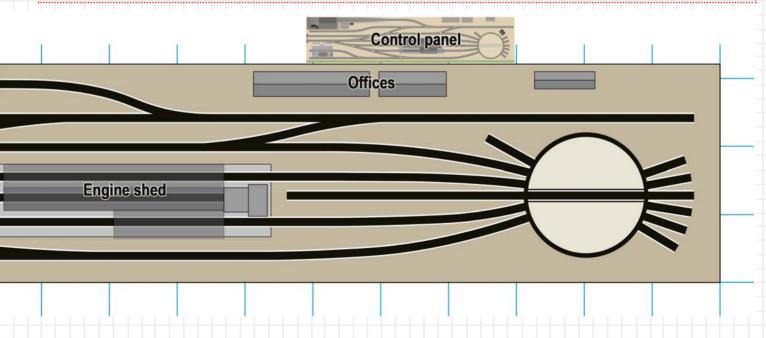

Tired of your trees looking similar, or worse, like lollipops? Make your layout's foliage spectacular with these transformational tree techniques, as demonstrated by Michael Russell.

RAW MATERIALS



Obtain some roots from around a tree or hardwood bush or shrub. A neighbour had dug this bush up, which provided me with material. You are looking for the small fibrous roots. Cut them off with secateurs.



Break off as much dirt as you can from the roots, then clean them in water gently with a brush. For really small pieces, agitate the roots in the water and swill the water around.

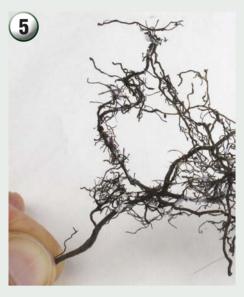


When dry, place the roots in a hot oven for 10 minutes, or in a microwave for 30 seconds. This will kill any wildlife or spores in the material. Leave it to cool and sort into

MIXED TREES IN A COPSE



Sort out lanky and leggy pieces of root. Cut to the approximate height for the scale you're modelling. Trim branches to shape and save the trimmings. Multistemmed pieces are great for variety.



Chop small pieces of left-over root to use as branches. Add PVA glue to the tree pieces and sprinkle the root pieces on. Allow to dry.



To bulk out the branches and form twigs, brush on PVA glue, then sprinkle with static grass. Any colour will do, though I tend to use the straw-coloured shades. 6mm long grass works well.



Spray new branches and twigs with paint to blend them into the main body of the tree. It doesn't have to be a perfect match, so long as it is close. Acrylic paint is ideal for this task.



To model leaves, brush on PVA glue and sprinkle coarse or fine turf of your desired colour across the top. For variety, and to differentiate between species and individual trees, use a few shades of scatter.



I chose to model autumn at the point where some of the leaves have fallen, but not all, using a variety of colours. Some leaves turn brown, others bright colours. I used the Noch leaf foliage autumn set.

FREE-STANDING CENTREPIECE TREE



Find a piece of material that is a good starting point for a large tree. You want a good-sized bole and main limbs. Also, ensure you find a piece where the main branches taper to fine points, like the real thing.



Add branches by dipping the end in cyanoacrylate glue and, while holding them in place, spraying with an activator for a quick bond. Wear a face mask and ensure good ventilation.



It can take a while to build up a good canopy. Use an 'extra hand' tool to help you hold the tree still as you work. Place branches into empty gaps where the tree has grown to maximise light.



Larger spots of glue can show up against the dark of the branches. By viewing the tree from all angles you can correct this by mixing acrylic to the same colour and blending it in carefully using a small paintbrush.



The glue will dry to a gloss finish. You can correct this with a spray of matt varnish.

MAKING AN OLD TREE



Find a large root with some character. The piece that I chose had a large portion damaged during extraction. A limb was partially attached, so I tore the piece off and used it as a feature.



I drilled a hole in the bole and used a cocktail stick as a mounting point in the scenery. This also makes trees easier to work on because it gives you something to grip.



I needed to add another branch to fill out the volume of the tree. I chose another root piece, drilled a hole and used a cocktail stick as a dowel to attach the new branch.



Planted in the scenery, I glued further roots to the ground to represent fallen branches. This tree was simple to model, yet is full of character and charm.

MAKING A DEAD TREE



Select raw material that is light in colour, so it looks like the bark has fallen away. You can spray or hand paint it to a lighter colour, if necessary. A lack of branches is an advantage for this subject.

EVERGREENS



Trees like holly and conifers are dense and so are best portrayed using lichen. First, glue your lichen to a piece of 0.5 to 1mm thick wire with contact adhesive. Use several pieces to get a



Spray with scenic glue and sprinkle with green ground foam turf or flock. Holly should be the darkest green you can find, whereas some conifers are light in tone. Leylandii hedges, popular in the 1970s, are still quite common in gardens.



Evergreens provide welcome relief and body to autumn and winter scenes. Holly, in particular, is native and a common species in woods and copses. However, don't make holly trees too tall as they don't attain a great height.

YOUNG TREES



Select small pieces of raw seamoss. Pick off any plant leaves that remain as these detract from the finish.



I sprayed my trees with a brown for the trunk and main branches and green for the foliage. The seamoss branch ends look like newly-emerged leaves, giving a realistic portrayal of young trees in the spring.



Planted in the environment they look the part, but are very delicate. Note how I've planted two pieces backto-back to form a more rounded tree. Don't be afraid of modelling multi-trunk trees.

TREES AMONG CATTLE



Find a piece of seamoss with a good crown to represent a mature tree. Snip off the lower stalk and trim the lower foliage to a flat plane to mimic the grazing of deer and horses



Add a new trunk from a piece of tree root. Find something that is suitably proportioned in relation to the size of the canopy. Glue with PVA or an impact



Grazers often scuff the soil around the base of the tree where they seek shade in sunny conditions. Use real roots to model the tree roots by gluing them to the ground, then partially cover them with scatter.



Many animals take shade under trees in summer weather - the season in which most of us choose to set our layouts. Tree roots are often exposed on slopes, especially if the soil isn't held in place by vegetation.



From afar, you can't make out the trunks or much detail of trees. Model these by cutting the stalk off a piece of ready-flocked seamoss. Simply glue to the scenery with PVA or impact adhesive.

PRACTICAL BRM

CUSTOM TREES



This root had a nice trunk, but little in the way of branches. Drill holes to receive branches made of wire. Existing branches are retained if they add to the tree's character, and some are lengthened.



Paint the Milliput to match the rest of the tree and weather it all remembering to use some green for moss. I flicked various shares of cream and green at the tree using a toothbrush.



Use a pair of scissors to trim the tree; the type used by hairdressers are best suited for this. Hold the tree up to the light so that you can see all the stray fibres and cut



Twist together iron wire used for tying plants, which is pliable, to make branches. Ensure your twists are either clockwise or anti-clockwise and use pliers. Use loops of twisted wire or cyanoacrylate to hold the wire bundles together.



Coat the branches in PVA glue. Tear off strips of teased out Noch foliage sheets and add to the branches, ensuring that you cover all of the wire skeleton. Leave to dry.



Spray the underside of the foliage pads with a green darker than the foliage on top of the pads. This mimics foliage in shade. I mixed mine by adding some black to a green acrylic.



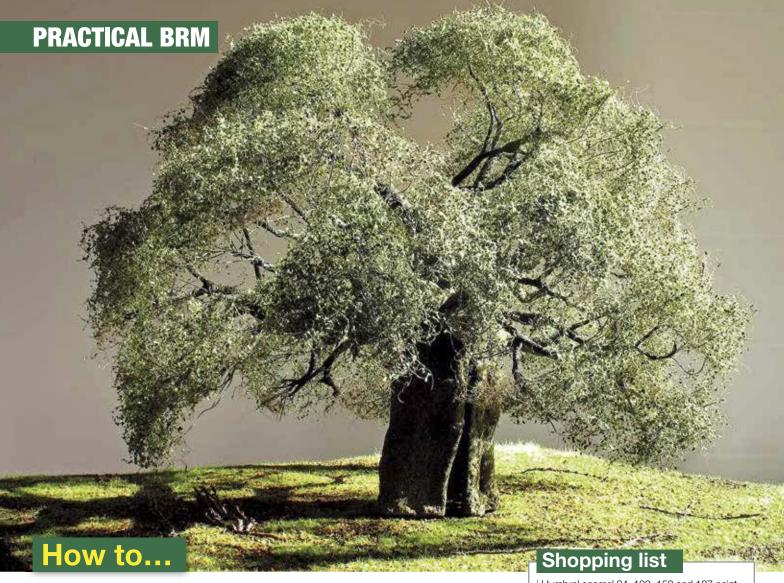
Mix Milliput and use this to cover the twisted sections of the wire. Glue the branches into place with cyanoacrylate and ensure that the branch diameter matches the trunk.



There will be places where the process of tearing and handling the foliage has caused gaps to appear. Add move PVA adhesive and sprinkle over loose Noch leaves to cover these.



When planted, the trunk has character, a natural curve and the retained branches look like dead material. The new branches blend, too. It's easier to make a tree this way than using just wire. With a little grass added to disguise the trunk, it's the perfect addition to a park.

War World Scenics fine cork pieces

Ardent arborist Michael Russell shows how to make a scenic centrepiece for your layout.

he oak is the classic native British tree and has played a vital part in our nation's history. I've always been fascinated with ancient trees, and old oak trees are very distinctive as they age and their branches acquire an appearance akin to a stag's head.

Many ancient trees have a hollow trunk and since I haven't seen this in model form, I thought I'd attempt to create one. If you want to model a detailed tree at the front of your layout, choose something like this with character. Take your time and the results will speak for themselves.

Top tips

Make a stand before working on the tree that's large enough to prevent it from toppling whilst you work on it.

- My model is the correct size for 4mm:1ft scale.
 Trees are larger than you think, but many are made under scale.
- Use a metal that's easy to work with such as copper mains cable.
- The age of a tree is often indicated by the angle of its branches. Older trees have more horizontal, downward pointing branches.

Look in tree books for the silhouette of each species and follow it – this is probably the most important criteria for modelling trees in smaller scales.



Start with a piece of 15mm x 20mm x 60mm balsa wood, drill a 3mm hole down its centre and insert the handle from a modelling paint brush. An old brush with poor quality bristles is ideal for this.



Equally cut eight pieces of quadrant strip with a mitre saw. I cut mine 8cm long, but it depends how tall you'd like to make your tree.



When happy with the centre carving, glue the pieces with PVA. Keep the pins in place until the glue has set. Continue carving the outside to get the basic shape.



Repeat the previous two steps until you've built a good crown. Vary the number of cables in each branch to add variety.



When the Milliput has set, twist the wires together. You can use your fingers for this, and then tighten using pliers. Keep splitting and continue until you've a few strands left for twigs - leave these straight at this stage.





Place eight pieces around the core and hold in place with pins as you build up the shape you require. You can number the pieces so that you can disassemble and reassemble at will when carving.



Take 3mm diameter mains power cable and cut three 15cm lengths. Strip each outer sheath respectively to a third, a half and two thirds.



Mix Milliput putty and begin adding to the top of the tree, starting with the inner surfaces, spreading outwards.



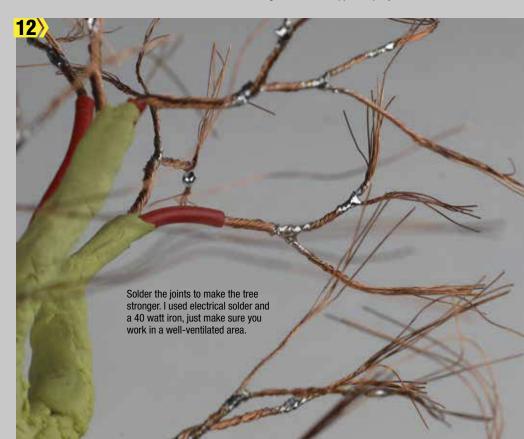
Carve the quadrants to shape and the central piece where necessary. Here I'm shaving the inside of a quadrant to form the hollow of the tree.



Drill three holes in the trunk and superglue the cables in. Bind with $0.5 \, \text{mm}$ wire.



Continue down onto the trunk adding Milliput to form mounds where branches used to be. I used a cut-down hog hair brush to stipple the putty and add texture.





Place limbs and branches into their final positions, then cover missed areas with Milliput. You want to cover all the electrical cable sheathing and ensure an even taper on the branches.



Cover the branches with a bark mix applied with a stiff paint brush. You don't need to cover the twigs. The bark mix is made from all-purpose powder filler mixed with PVA glue and black acrylic paint to give a grey colour.



Sprinkle silver sand over whilst the bark mix is still wet. Repeat this stage and the previous until the underlying tree frame is hidden. Ensure that none of the twists in the wires show through.



Spread the twigs starting from the centre of the tree. These need to be equidistant from each other, because a tree grows to maximise the light reaching the canopy top. Spray the twigs with grey car primer.



Paint the tree with a wide variety of greys, browns and greens. Use an actual tree for reference. I used an airbrush and dry-brushing to get the effects I desired.



Flick white and yellow shades of paint at the tree to represent lichen. I used acrylic paint for this, but don't overdo the effect.



Tease artificial hair (known as Postiche) out to a fine web of fibres.



Working over small areas at a time, spread the fibres over the end of the branches and fix with hairspray.



With hairspray still wet, scatter leaves over the Postiche using a sieve to control the flow. I used Noch leaves. If you've different packets of leaves, mix them together from the outset.



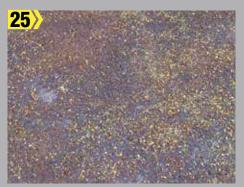
Brush off stray leaves from inside the tree.



Once you've covered the tree, fix the foliage permanently with a spray of matt varnish aerosol.



Trim the tree for stray hairs. Hairdresser's scissors work best for this. Work against the light so the hair fibres show. Use wire cutters to trim overly long twigs.



I represented fallen leaves and ground cover using a mixture of leaves from the Noch Autumn Foliage leaf set. Sprinkle a few of the green leaves that you used on the tree to depict newly fallen leaves. Fix in place with PVA.



Add static grass, but remember that the growth under a tree is affected by the shade. It's much lusher outside of the canopy, although on an older tree such as this there would be gaps in the canopy.



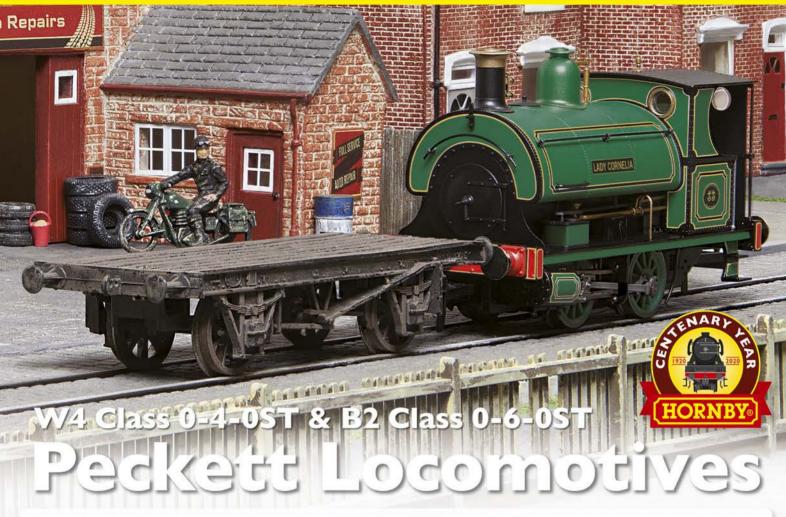
To represent fallen acorns I used cork pieces from the WWS range. Sieve them to get a smaller size.



Use real twigs for fallen branches. I used pieces of heather stem as they scale nicely.







Despite hard work and poor maintenance, the Peckett locomotives were tough and long-lasting. Many Peckett locomotives survive to this day often seen working on today's heritage railways.

HOW TO... BUILD A 1970S BUNGALOW

Phil Parker recommends this range of buildings for beginners as he constructs a mid-century house, with strong memories of youth.



hat's the hardest part of creating a model building? To my mind, it's designing something convincing. We all know what a house looks like, but when you start to draw one up for a model, getting the proportions right and achieving the right look, well, that's more challenging than the process of building it.

Don't think you can swamp a model in detail to make it look right. It doesn't really matter what you are making - a building, locomotive or even a figure - if the proportions aren't right, the model will look wrong, even if you have counted the correct number of rivets.

To make things harder, imagine a relatively modern building, not a Victorian red-brick house, but the sort of suburban

local area. Maybe you'll find examples of architectural prize-winning buildings, but those mundane dwellings that appear in their thousands? That's tougher.

Looking through In The Greenwood's range, I was struck by the semi-detached bungalow. I know this building. As a child, one of my friends lived in a cul-de-sac where half of the houses were just like it. If I take a bus from Leamington to Warwick, we drive through the middle of an estate with many similar looking buildings.

Common as they are, I've never seen them modelled. It's odd, because those buildings are still there. Over the years, their owners have modified them with new windows and extensions, but you can still recognise the basics.

The solution is supplied flat-packed and

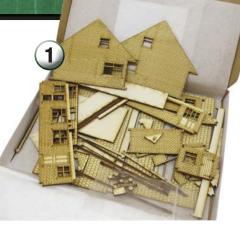
cut in high-quality plywood for the price of a cheap model railway wagon.

The designer has a good eye. The bungalow looks right, and we get a variety of window and door styles built in to show they aren't brand new, but have undergone personalisation over the years thanks to the efforts of double-glazing salespersons.

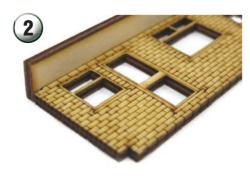
If you've never built a building kit before, this is perfect. Strictly speaking, the only thing a modeller needs to supply is glue (PVA) and paint. I chose to upgrade my model a little with new slates, but even then, the only tools required was a sharp knife and a coarse abrasive stick.

Assembly in its most-basic form could easily be completed in an evening. I added a couple of hours' worth of detailing and spent a few more on the paintwork, but none of this was rushed or difficult.

The finished model looks attractive and takes me back to the days of going round to my friend David's to race our toy cars in his back garden.



Open the box and say hello to a large pile of parts cut in 3mm thick plywood. Some of the smaller components are sensibly contained in a plastic bag so they aren't lost.



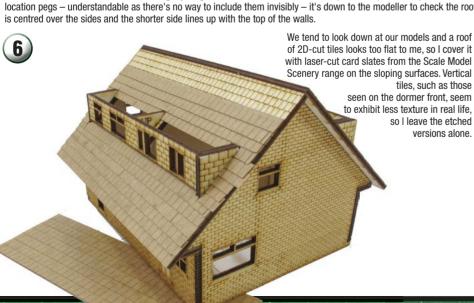
For the first step, I'm diverting from the instructions. Putting the overhang onto the front walls before fitting them to the sides means they are a nice snug fit. This is the only significant deviation in the entire build, but being the first thing I do, is a little scary.



It's essential to keep the model square and flat. To achieve this, I'm building it on an old bathroom mirror using squares to keep checking everything is where it should be. Using PVA, the process is really quick, especially as the part fit is excellent.



The roof halves aren't identical, one is slightly longer than the other so should overlap at the top. With no positive location pegs - understandable as there's no way to include them invisibly - it's down to the modeller to check the roof



Dormer ends are made up and fit into the holes in the roof. A diagram in the instructions shows how to do this, but pay attention to make sure you get the bits the right way up. The front window panes slot into the rebates.



The dormer flat roof should be fitted and the trim piece added to cover the gap at the back. I prefer to chamfer this with an abrasive stick so it sits against the slates properly.

PRACTICAL BRM



Modifying the flat roof means the bargeboards now stick out too far and need to be thinned with the abrasive. You could replace them with thin cardboard just as easily.



An optional porch is included. Don't glue this in place before painting, or you won't be able to get the brush



Windows and doors are pale grey (Humbrol 147) and again, a couple of coats are needed on the inside edges. Working along the etched lines makes working neat and easy, but keeping a brush damp with thinners handy to wipe away excess paint is a good idea.



Curtains are strips of coloured paper, cut from a Sunday supplement, glued with Deluxe Materials Glue'n'Glaze



of pots left from a Wills spares pack in my collection. I'm assuming one has been replaced in the past to explain why they are different sizes – not just because I only had one of each.





For yellow bricks, I dry-brush some cream (Humbrol 103) and follow this with Pale Stone (121), dabbed with a sponge. The garage is the perfect place to test paint effects before moving on the main building. The corners take a couple of coats to cover the burnt edges from the cutting process, but it doesn't seem like much of a problem.



Clear plastic glazing has to be supplied by the modeller - your plastic recycling bin is a surprisingly good source for it. Fix in place with Deluxe Materials Glue'n'Glaze adhesive which dries clear.



I don't like to see through a building, so simple internal walls are cut from foamboard. Making these slightly oversize ensures they stay put, the material compresses slightly between the strong plywood walls, although a little glue is belt and braces.



The finishing touch is an etched satellite dish from Ten Commandments held to the chimney with a track pin. If you fit more than one, remember that, in the UK, they should all point southeast.

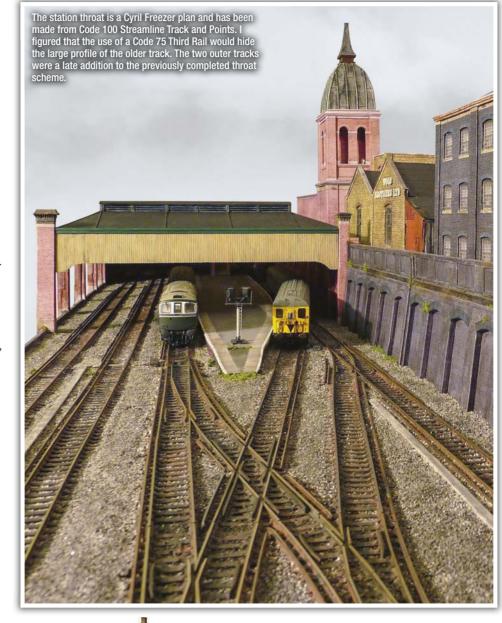

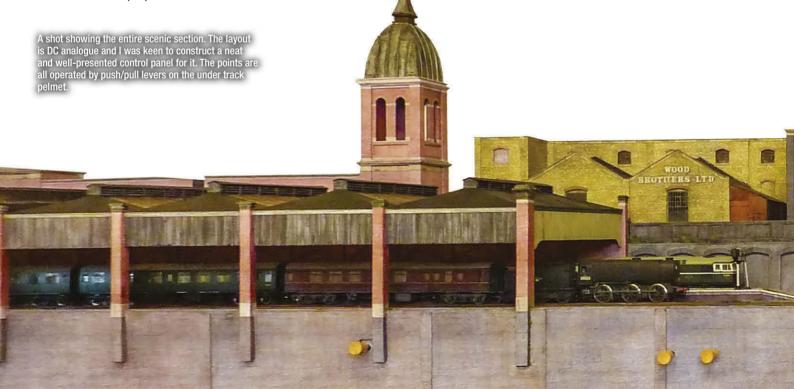
determined to construct the new micro layout without having to delve into precious savings. With this in mind, my eye fell on an old, unfinished station throat that had been lying around the loft gathering dust for years. This presented me with a good starting point and it was swiftly put to work. It had been originally constructed at the beginning of my railway modelling journey and was a bit of a pig's ear with its Code 100 track and short radius points – however, I decided that the addition of Code 75 third rail would go a long way to hide the large profile of the older track.

Construction

The original layout, a copy of a Cyril Freezer plan, was a mere 4ft long, so I decided to lengthen it by about a foot. I also added 4in along the front to incorporate a couple of tracks on a 1-in-80 incline; the initial idea being to link the micro scene with my larger, loft-based, run around. However, I found that there wouldn't be enough space to wedge in the necessary station fiddle yards to the rear, so I decided to stick to a simple end-to-end arrangement. A 3ft 'black box' was therefore made to accommodate trains arriving at the half station platform and a 5ft feeder yard was constructed on the right. The larger fiddle yard can accommodate six trains. I was lucky enough to have had a few yards of Code 100 track and points left over from previous schemes, so my only additional expense was a sheet of 12mm MDF for their construction. The original points hadn't been motorised, so I simply made push-pull knobs and installed an analogue switch panel at the front.

This was an easy layout to construct







A superb Hornby Q1 is about to leave on its long journey south. The roof is loosely based on that of King's Cross Suburban Station. The valance has been made from a Plastikard profile and the ventilators from layers of alternating widths of mounting card.



Under the canopy, the roof structure has been made from 1mm dia galvanized wire that has been soldered together in various jigs. The roof lights, a CG Texture printed onto acetate, lend the scene realism.

because most of the work on the track and station throat had been done years ago. As mentioned, this older section had been lying around the loft for years and it seemed a pity that it had never been completed. It therefore formed the basis of 'Folgate Street' and saved me a lot of construction time as a consequence. In fact, the only difficult challenge was to ensure the new fiddle yards at each end lined up with the scenic section tracks. Further to that, the scenic tracks have to be cleaned regularly, especially the point blades – the point frogs aren't separately switched, so the points have to get their electricity via the blade contacts.

The platform, station roof and buildings were quick to make and it was completed within two months during the 'lockdown' period. A wonderful way to beat the boredom blues!

Scenic area

'Folgate Street' is an attempt to bring bits of London together in one place, hence the inclusion of the Lyceum Theatre building. It is, however, interesting to note that the downloaded CG texture of the derelict shop fronts is a real photograph of those found on Norton Folgate in London – this street scene has lent the layout its name.

I wanted to capture the 'canyons of brick' and run-down feel, typical of the place and time depicted. The station needed to look like it had been in continuous use and also contain elements of its Victorian steam origin. Therefore, the roof structure was loosely based on that of the Kings Cross Suburban station. It has been made from 1mm diameter galvanised wire that has been soldered together in various jigs and

Apart from the Lima Class 73 and the Hornby Q1, all models are 'as bought'. I weather and detail second-hand purchases, but generally leave new models alone – they're too expensive to risk! The Heljan green Class 33 is the only factory-weathered example, while the rest of the locomotives are in pristine condition.

is removable for track cleaning. The grimy sky lights, a downloaded texture from CG Textures, has been simply printed onto acetate and glued over the openings to enhance the grotty atmosphere required.

The embankments and buildings are all covered in various Scalescenes brick textures - these are beautifully rendered, weathered and are an extremely versatile product to use. They are merely coated in an acrylic matt varnish once pasted down. However, I have used a very watered-down black wash on the embankment walls to achieve a well-worn look. I have also used weathering powders to add final touches, but these are applied carefully as I'm a great believer in the 'less is more' technique. To achieve the crisp and consistent arches in the station and embankment walls, I used a compass cutter - a cheap and essential tool for those who like working with card.

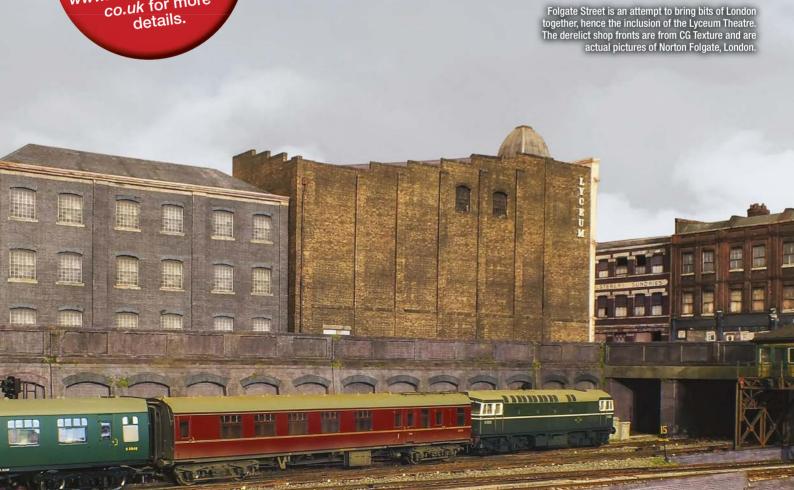
Most of the buildings are freelance structures and all are simply plonked down behind the embankment walls. The derelict shops and factory building on the over bridge are also from CG Textures. These were downloaded, scaled to the correct size, and 'layered' to enhance a three-dimensional look. While I recognise that photo realism and bits of wire is not everyone's idea of modelling, you can create some realistic dioramas with judicial use.

Final thoughts

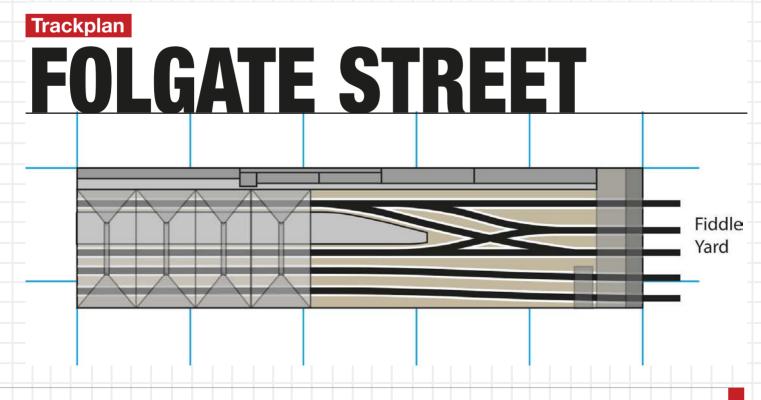
Building 'Folgate Street' was just the cure for the lockdown blues and it's surprising what you can achieve when you have plenty of time on your hands. I've already had hours of fun running my collection of Southern Region EMUs and locomotives. While all the points are powered via their blade contacts, the larger units, with multi-wheel pickups, glide through them with relative ease. The layout has also proven to have been a valuable lesson in the recycling of old projects and it has cost very little to build. In fact, my only purchases, apart from mounting card and MDF, was a secondhand Hornby Q1 and a few of signals!

I easily get bored with a layout upon completion, so 'Folegate Street' may simply be dismantled and the buildings stored away for use on future schemes. In fact, 'Up The Junction' has long since been taken apart and the buildings used elsewhere – note how I've reused the 'Wood Brothers' Factory at 'Folgate Street'. However, 'Folgate Street' is small and modular, so it could easily be used for exhibition, but, due to illness and the Covid outbreak, there are no plans to do this for the foreseeable future. At the moment, I'm happy just to run my third rail locomotives on it.

Finally, who said you can't make a silk purse out of a sow's ear?

ONE CHASSIS -TWO IDENTITIES

Keen to add variety to his motive power fleet. Phil Parker builds a pair of 3D-printed industrial locomotive kits around Hornby's reliable B2 'Peckett' 0-6-0 chassis.



♦ The trickiest part of any locomotive kit is the chassis. I have dozens of locomotive builds under my belt and still find the process of making the model move reliably, frustrating. Assembling a kit that doesn't move is simple, but building one that moves with the silky smoothness of a modern RTR locomotive is a lot tougher.

Take Hornby's B2 0-6-0 'Peckett'. It's a superb model and runs perfectly, but constructing kits was more justifiable when an RTR short-wheelbase locomotive meant something with a Scalextric motor, which offered the same level of control as I have over my cat.

Building a better mechanism was well within my skill level, but now manufacturers have raised the bar. If you can't beat them, join them, as the saying goes.

Hornby makes an amazing model, but its range on offer is only a small percentage of potential prototypes. That's where the cottage industries, so long a part of our hobby, come in.

We're looking at kits from Hardy's Hobbies and Railway Mania. Both have produced bodyshells that can be fitted to Hornby's chassis to offer superb running, with ease of assembly. And, they provide a different prototype for your layout. After all, so many have purchased Hornby B3 'Pecketts', so to stand out from the crowd, you need something different.

Both kits use the latest 3D-printing technology, resulting in models that can be assembled with a minimum of tools, and nothing more than superglue. The manufacturers have taken slightly different approaches to the design of their kits, but neither can be described as hard to build. The steps are very similar for each model, so I've tried not to repeat myself when describing them.

It might seem odd to buy a lovely RTR locomotive just for its chassis, but modellers have been doing this since the 1960s when they would fit poorly-shaped whitemetal bodies on top.

My suggestion is to keep an eye out for bargains - perhaps unpopular liveries that can be picked up reasonably cheaply, or online auctions for damaged models, so long as the chassis is fine.

Mind you, changing the body takes less than a few minutes, so two locomotives could share the same chassis - it's something worth thinking about.

16in Bagnall - Hardy's Hobbies



Thanks to lockdown supply issues, the model supplied to BRM by Hardy's Hobbies is printed in a translucent green rather than the normal grey. We've been assured that, by the time you read this, the models will be grey. Since I'm going to paint it anyway, the colour doesn't matter. The box also contains 3D-printed parts, brass wire, handrail knobs, a whitemetal smokebox, door handles, nuts and



One of the first jobs I like to do with any locomotive kit is to fit the nuts that hold the body to the chassis. They are usually accessible, but this isn't the case with every as I've found out to my cost in the past!



All the holes for handrail knobs are opened with a 0.9mm drill using the marked dimples as a guide. The print material drills easily. Wire handrails slide in and everything is held with superglue.



The Hornby body is removed from the chassis by undoing screws at either end, one of which is hidden under the coupling. No modifications are required to the chassis for either locomotive other than painting the wheel centres in a colour to match the body.



It's hard enough to assess how well a kit has assembled when the raw materials are bright green. A light spray of primer turns everything grey, which makes spotting areas that need further attention easier.



A separate float includes all the details. I remove the crew and paint everything else while still attached as it's much easier to handle the pieces.

Although the 3D-printed shell is good, I lightly sanded some of the flatter areas to make them as smooth as possible. Abrasive sticks ensure that flat areas stay flat, using fingers and emery paper can produce slight undulations



A coat of mid-green, satin finish Humbrol (131), applied with an airbrush is followed by matt black (33). I find this brushes well and saves a lot of fiddly masking. Using Fox Transfers, I letter it into my fictitious Barrow Union Docks Committee fleet. I should have gloss-varnished the sides first to hide the transfer carrier film at the bottom of the letters, though hopefully it will disappear under the weathering.

A third locomotive?

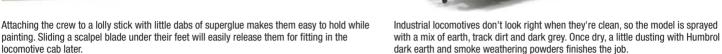
Since no modifications were required to the chassis for either model, it's possible to put the original Hornby body back on, giving you a third option.

The only problem is that I matched the wheel and body colours of my models, so the RTR body would also need a repaint. Of course, if you could match the original Hornby colour on the kit bodies, that would solve the problem.



PRACTICAL BRM







Avonside B4 - Railway Mania



Railway Mania split the Avonside into a large number of components to allow for prototype variations in a single kit. This is the 'Portbury' version, which comes with extra buffers because the prototype had a mix of styles.



Keeping the model in separate lumps makes painting easy as there's no need to mask the footplate if you decide to spray it. Cab detail is accessed through the floor. You'd not reach it if the cab was fitted firmly to the footplate. Make sure the body-retaining nuts are fitted firmly at this stage; the front one is inaccessible once the smokebox is fitted.



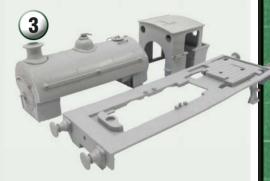
Steam locomotives need coal, so I fill the bunker with dark grey foam and sprinkle crushed coal on top, fixed with a drop of superglue.



Handrails are fitted in the same way as the Bagnall, although not all sit in knobs. There are a few grab rails beside the filler and another pair on the cab that are just bent wire. You need a smaller (0.45mm) drill bit for these. The smokebox dart is made from brass parts, allowing the clock hands to be set any way you like.



The thin footplate is flexible, but screwing it to the chassis keeps it flat while the rest of the body is glued in place. Once the glue has dried, the body is as strong as the one-piece Bagnall.



Buffers are attached with superglue and then the model is primed and lightly smoothed.



Both locomotives are glazed using Deluxe Materials Glue'n'Glaze once they are weathered. Place a drop of this in the spectacle plate hole and waggle it around to form a skin filling the aperture. Prop the model so this is horizontal while the liquid dries to ensure a flat finish.

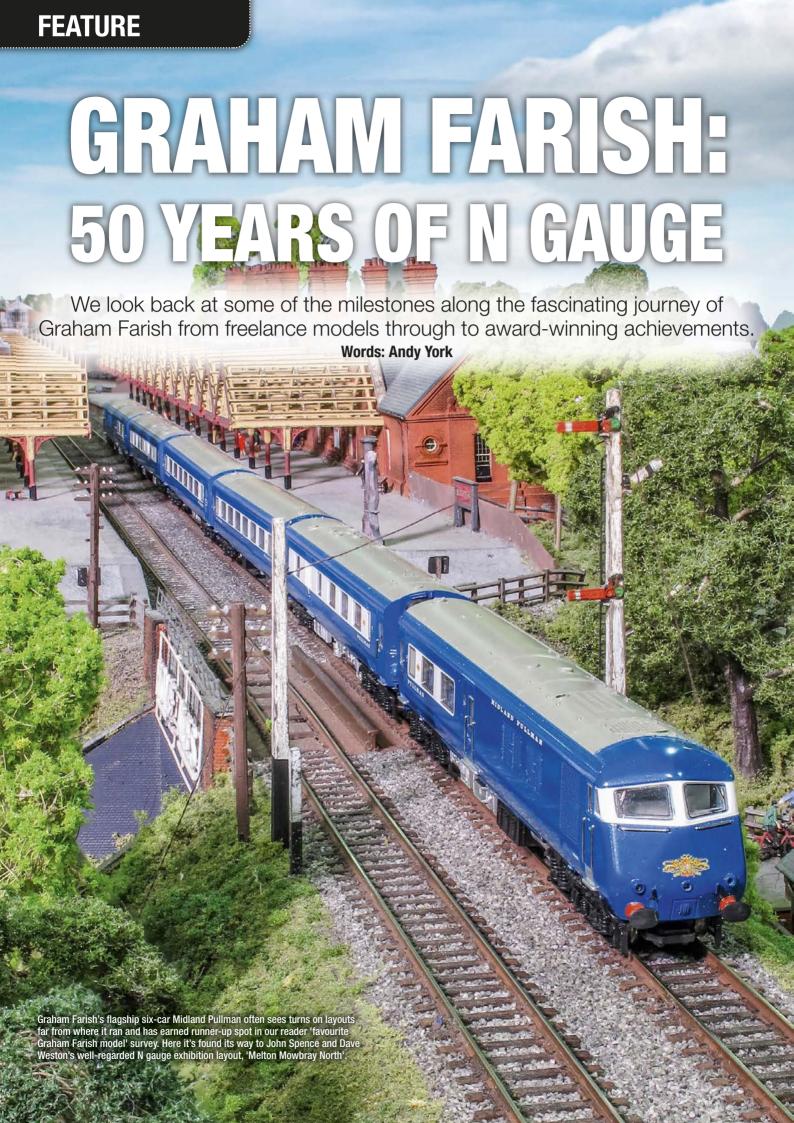

n the autumn of 1970, a new name for 2mm:1ft scale broke cover. Graham Farish was already well-known for its OO gauge locomotives and Formoway trackwork. Originating in Bromley in 1919, the company started by manufacturing components for the radio industry through to production of grenade and land-mine casings during WW2. As wartime austerities eased, the company looked to the hobby market, beating Rovex to the shop shelves by launching a Black Five in 1949. 1964 saw the business move from Kent to Holton Heath near Poole, while the OO gauge range dwindled to mainly rolling stock and track as the business developed in other directions, including full-sized motor boats.

The 'eighties saw the range get into a steady stride of growth with Graham Farish establishing itself as the leading supplier of N gauge products. The steam stable saw the Fowler 2P 4-4-0 introduced initially in LMS and BR liveries, followed by spurious Somerset & Dorset and Caledonian liveries with the freelance coaches to match in pre-grouping liveries. This generic approach waned during the decade as more diesels were added to the range with a Class 47, HST power cars, Mk. 3 coaches and a Class 37 in 1981 and the start of a BR Mk.1 coach range with printed sides. 1982 brought a 'Castle' and 'Duchess' for express power and a Class 20 and Met-Cam DMU for the transition era onwards. The following year brought a Class 50 and Class 25 with a 'Deltic', 'Western' and GW Railcar following in 1984/5. A 57XX 'Pannier' joined the stable then, too, utilising the 0-6-0 chassis that also became a staple platform for bodyline kits from other suppliers with a J94 on the same chassis in 1986. The same year saw more heavy power in the shape of the LMS 8F and Class 40 diesel. The locomotive range was joined by pressure-ventilated and airconditioned Mk. 2 coaches through the decade and more wagons steadily joining the range with more modern air-braked stock available, too.

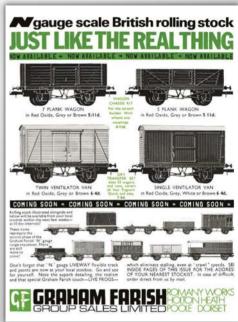
1987 brought the LNER A3 and Class 33, while the last couple of years of the decade were somewhat less frenetic after Farish scored a scale victory. Peter Graham Farish said "Minitrix had some very nice quality products and we heard a rumour going round that they were thinking of introducing the Flying Scotsman in 1:160 scale at the next British Toy Fair. As it happened, we had already drawn up plans for this locomotive, but had scheduled it for release later in that summer, because we were also tooling up another exciting locomotive for the Toy Fair. However, we knew that this could be a turning point if Minitrix released its Flying Scotsman first, so we dropped our previous tooling schedule and instead went all out to deliver our 1:148 version of the 'Flying Scotsman' into the market before Christmas

Another colossal effort - but we managed it, and in so doing we believe that we scooped the market - and even began to persuade Hornby/ Minitrix that they would either have to retool for the

Before 1970

The start of British ready-to-run N gauge can trace its roots back to more than a decade earlier with Lone Star's push-along OOO gauge models, followed by band-driven Class 23 and Class 24 models and rolling stock. In 1967, Minitrix introduced a Class 27 and Mk. 1 coaches, Lima made tentative moves into the scale with British-outline models under the G&R Wrenn brand, including Mk.1 coaches, too, Peco produced N gauge trackwork from the mid-sixties, British-outline kits to fit continental chassis and the decade ended with the introduction of Peco's excellent 'Jubilee' class produced by Rivarossi. The building blocks made the scale viable and the N Gauge Society was formed in 1967. What was needed for wider adoption was a cohesive range. Another element to this combination of domestic and European interbreeding was a less than unified approach to scale. Continental products were scaled at 1:160, while British N gauge was determined as 1:148 scale - something not resolved, ultimately, until 1997.





British Market in 1:148 scale or suffer lessening sales. There seemed to be some truth to this theory because, quite suddenly, Minitrix later withdrew from the UK market, for the same probable reason that Lima had withdrawn sometime previously. It was real David and Goliath stuff!"

At the end of the decade, a promotional model was made for Shredded Wheat with a push-along version of the General-Purpose tank and four-wheel coaches in a fictitious black and yellow livery, which could be gained collecting tokens from the packets and an additional notional payment. The offer ran through into 1990 and must have kept the dispatch department busy!

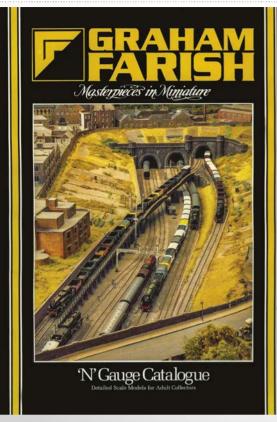

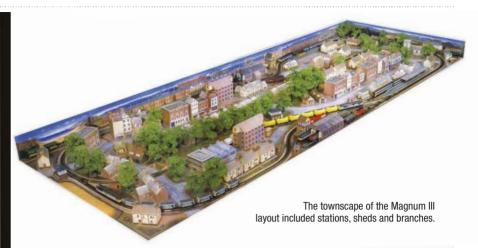

1990s

Discretionary spending was under pressure at the turn of the decade with high inflation and recession but Graham Farish got back up to ECML speed with a Class 91 and Mk. 4 coaches before a well-regarded Standard 4MT 2-6-4T arrived in 1991. The modern crosscountry scene was also catered for that year with the Class 158, and a Class 159 following in 1994. 1993 gave us the LMS 'Crab', the Fowler 4F and a Class 56. Another electric in the shape of the Class 90 arrived in 1995, plus a Class 31. 1996 brought a 3F Jinty and 8750 'Pannier' on the ubiquitous 0-6-0 chassis. Rebuilt 'Merchant Navies' and 'Battles of Britain' came in 1997, looking very similar in length and shape! A Class 87 came in 1998 with an A4 and Class 57 in 1999. As a range of buildings were developed based on a solid shell with stick-on facings, Graham Farish took its concept of a complete range a stage further with the Magnum plans and sets to enable the modeller to produce a complete layout from the company's products that could be extended and joined together to create impressive scenes.



To mark the retirement of Peter Graham Farish, 47747 was named at Poole station on August 23, 2000. Chris Green, left, of Virgin Trains presented a nameplate to Graham Hubbard of Bachmann Europe, centre, and Peter Graham Farish, right, which still hangs in Bachmann's reception at Barwell.

2000s

The new millennium saw a GW King manufactured before the Poole-based business was sold to Bachmann Europe PLC as a whollyowned subsidiary of Kader Industries in China when Peter Graham Farish decided to retire. Initially, any remaining stock was distributed and the final production line output assembled into what could be completed before production moved to China for the range. Inevitably, this period was somewhat of a hiatus in new releases until the V2 arrived in 2004. This model's body was designed and tooled for Poole production despite having a good Chinese chassis and hence has been viewed less than favourably than the standards achieved on subsequent models from China. Following the Turbostar of 2004, we saw the first locomotive from China in the shape of the Class 66 in 2005, with the Class 44/45/46 'Peaks' and a Class 186 in 2006. A 'Jubilee' to finally surpass Peco's offering came in 2007 with a Class 66/9 variant, a well-regarded Class 60 and the diminutive Class 04. 2008 delivered plenty; a rebuilt 'Royal Scot', a newly-tooled Class 47 and 37/0, a Class 42 'Warship', Class 108 DMU and a Class 08 - something of a bumper year! A Class 150/2 came in the following year to finish a busy decade. On the coaching stock side, the 2000s saw re-tooled Mk. 1 suburban coaches with moulded detail, plus a new range of LMS Period 3 coaches in 2008 and an increasingly detailed and diverse range of wagons.

2010s

The last decade has seen many earlier locomotives re-tooled, including the Black Five, Class 101 DMU, Class 20, streamlined 'Merchant Navy', Fowler 4F, 'Duchess', 3F 'Jinty', 'Castle', Class 57, 'Deltic', Class 31, Class 25 and Standard 4MT 2-6-4T and most recently the Class 40 – all with added DCC capabilities and functions. Those with sound have been well-received. New locomotives and units to the range have been prolific, too – an LNER B1, the 'Deltic' prototype from the National Railway Museum, Standard 4MT 4-6-0 and Standard 3MT 2-6-2T, Class 24, Class 14 from 2010. 2011 brought the LNER A1 'Pacific', Class 03 and 4-car 4CEP EMU. At this time the re-tooled Mk. 1 main line coaches with moulded detail and flush-glazing started to emerge to much acclaim. Quality moved onwards in 2012 with a 2-8-0 'Austerity', Standard 5MT 4-6-0 and two impressive units, the Class 350 'Desiro' and the six-car Midland Pullman. The following year saw the J39, Ivatt 2MT 2-6-0, 64XX 'Pannier' and the Class 70 come around. 2014 gave us the LNER A2, LMS Fairburn 2-6-4T and a refurbished-style Class 37/4 and 37/5. Moving to 2019, we saw how far forward the standards of decoration had come over the years with the SECR-liveried C Class 0-6-0. Coaching stock has not been neglected with a range of Bulleid coaches in 2013, GW Hawksworths in 2014, the exceptional SE&CR Birdcage stock in 2019, and the LNER Thompsons in 2020. As we approach the 50th anniversary of the brand, we eagerly await the all-new LMS 8F, which promises to be very good.



A modeller's view

Tom Everitt, respected N-gauge modeller and creator of 'Ropley' comments:

"My Farish journey, and my introduction to the world of N gauge, started with breakfast: A lot of Shredded Wheat was consumed to obtain the full promotional train set!

After using (playing with) my Grandfather's OO gauge layout, I was fascinated by the small size of this scale and, despite returning to OO gauge a few times since, N gauge has always been my scale of choice. The first powered Farish model I purchased, having furiously saved my pocket money for months, was a 'Merchant Navy' from a now-closed model shop in Newcastle while on holiday in Northumberland. It had two speeds, stop and fast, but I thought it was fantastic!

The first big turning point for me though, and

the model that sparked a revived interest in N gauge, was the Farish Standard 3MT. This really was a 'wow' moment when I first saw one and is ultimately responsible for my layout 'Ropley' coming into existence. It prompted a huge change in direction for me as all previous projects had been modern image, but this beautiful little model saw me move into the rarely-modelled preservation scene.

Initially, this was an excuse to run anything, but

Since then there has been a steady flow of some really quite beautiful models and new innovations under the Farish brand. The introduction of DCC fitted sound has probably had the most impact on my recent modelling after initially being quite sceptical about it. However, within a few minutes of having the 'Castle' and Class 40 steaming and whistling up and down the layout, my mind was firmly changed.

The motor is transverse in the firebox, the steering servo is mounted in the tender, and the battery is under

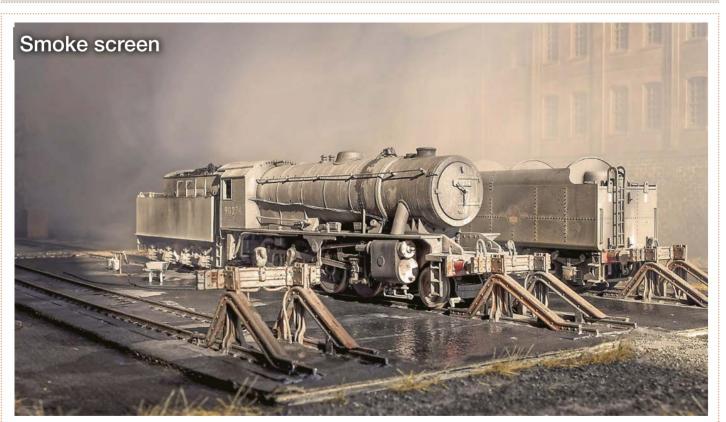

Although built purely for function over form, without aesthetic considerations, for me the War Department 2-8-0 'Dub Dee' is the most iconic locomotive for the depiction of the grimy, gritty and smoky world of the steam locomotive shed. The Bachmann incarnation is a superb model that accurately captures the prototype and gives you a sporting chance of taking realistic photographs. You can really go to town with the weathering too, as they were rarely, if ever, cleaned.

These cottage backs will form part of a 3D backscene on my P4 layout 'Callow Lane' and were made by modifying a Howard Scenics card kit. I've always liked the soft, mellow brickpaper, which is glued to 1.5mm Daler board. Some details such as the sash windows, gates and drainpipes were scratch-built. The kits are now available from Freestone Model Accessories and are relatively straightforward to assemble. 'Callow Lane' is on a fictitious Midland Railway freight-only line, set in South Gloucestershire in the 1960s.

HORNBY SLIDING DOOR MK. 3

legacy of British Rail, its Mk. 3 coach design was the last to emerge from Britain's nationalised railways. Constructed between 1975 and 1988, 848 units were produced at British Rail Engineering Ltd's Derby Litchurch Lane Works. As with BR's previous Mk. 1 and Mk. 2 rolling stock, designs evolved subtly, to better suit the needs of the network. Main differences are the Mk. 3 prototypes and standard HST stock without buffers, the Mk. 3A locomotive-hauled coaches with buffers constructed between 1975 and 1984 and the later Mk. 3B variants, with upgraded interior lighting and seats, as introduced between 1985 and 1988. Of steel monocoque construction – akin to similar developments within the car industry at the time - the coaches would offer passengers unrivalled space and a smoother ride thanks to bogie innovation within British Rail's research division. It was the age of the train...

Like many items of rolling stock on the network, throughout their lives, modifications have been necessary to maintain or improve levels of comfort expected by passengers on intermediate and long-distance travel. Since the privatisation of BR, the interior refurbishment of the coaches has been under the responsibility of the train operating companies (TOCs) and their desire to attract passengers – first-class interiors with high-backed seating and curtains seeing the 'swishest' of make-overs.

Interior lighting has also been upgraded to LEDs across many of the coaches that remain in service. With the large-scale withdrawal of the HST fleet, many Mk. 3 coaches have been retired from service, but GWR, Arriva Cross Country, and ScotRail have upgraded their fleets. The most significant changes recently made by these TOCs has been the fitting of sliding doors to meet Persons with Reduced Mobility regulations, in favour of passenger-operated types and adding retention tanks for the toilets to comply with modern pollution regulations.

Fleet status

GWR operates four, four-coach 'Castle' sets, each sandwiched between two HST power cars, mostly on services between Cardiff and Bristol or Taunton and between Exeter and Penzance. Any HST power car in GWR green can be used with these coaches, but

the celebrity pair of 43002 and 43185 weren't fitted with door controls to operate the automatic doors fitted to the sets.

Cross Country by Arriva operates seven sets with seven, or occasionally eight, coaches between two power cars. These are often seen on services between Plymouth and Leeds or Newcastle, although there have been variations such as a Thursday-only Penzance starter.

ScotRail operates five five-coach sets between two power cars. Branded as Inter7City, these coaches operate on services between Glasgow and Edinburgh, to Inverness and Aberdeen, in addition to

Living by numbers

When Hornby announced its models, formations for ScotRail's anticipated five-car sets hadn't been confirmed, the TOC expecting Wabtec to deliver four-car TGFB/TSD/TS/TSL sets, then producing the seventeen extra TSLs on a separate production line to be inserted into the service sets once completed. Vehicle numbers hadn't been allocated at that stage and with the TS vehicles potentially emerging from Wabtec as TS, TSL or TSDs, the fifth vehicles for set HA25 and HA26 could have been converted into TSDs. Hornby numbered the extra two vehicles as the TSLs from Sets HA23 and HA24 that were in works at the time.

Since May 2019, when artwork for the three operators was completed, based on the train diagrams and vehicle numbers in service at the time, the diagrams have changed, with coaches being swapped between sets as the TOC's operating requirements have altered. All three TOCs having changed vehicle numbers within their sets over the last twelve months. Though it has worked against Hornby for creating sets that continue in service unchanged, it highlights the fast-paced nature of train diagramming.

Scaling down

Kindly sent for review by the manufacturer are samples of TFD 41195 (R4942A) and TS 42342 (R4940) in Cross Country by Arriva livery with grey bodyshell, maroon roof, black window surrounds and 'hot pink' doors. The liveries applied by the three TOCs to their sliding door Mk. 3 coaches are more subtle than the early years of privatisation, and far easier on the eye in full-size and subsequent model form.

Livery application across the model is to a high standard, with crisp edges to paint colour overlays, a multitude of warning signs dotted around the bodysides and ends and authentic logos, faithfully miniaturised. The maroon applied to the ends and roof was found to be a little thin on the sample of the TS, the undercoat partially showing through to the roof ridges and ends, but appeared fine on the sample of the TFD. Not an issue as such, but the only noteworthy observation of an otherwise outstanding livery effort by the factory.

Form and function

Shape-wise, thanks to CAD design and extensive research by Hornby, the coach is - as expected - a faithful copy. The manufacturer regularly shares progress reports and site visits with its customers via the Engine Shed blog on its website. Despite all coaches having the same scale 75ft 6in wheelbase, window and roof details vary. TS 41195 has three flat roof ventilators at each end, TFD 42342 has one large centrallylocated raised square with rivet detail to each end. Roof access panels have a realistic raised edge, again with rivet detail, though the fine grab handles have been represented in a more simplistic form as a part of the injection-moulded plastic. Modellers seeking finer detail could look to replace these with thin bent wire equivalents for better realism.

Through the tinted windows of these coaches, little can be seen of the seating and compartmental dividers between the toilet cubicle and main seating area, but they are quite sufficient for average viewing. Access to the coach interior is very simple and doesn't require tools – the body top can be separated from the chassis easily. As with most model coaches, the unpainted interiors can be enhanced by painting seat backs

grey and adding figures, more so if interior lighting is a consideration.

At chassis level, the bogies are welldetailed, being more accurate copies of the BT10 variant than those fitted to its previous non-sliding door Mk. 3 coaches. The location of the spring and dampers looks 'right', though I'm not as keen on the large wheel flanges, despite the wheel faces offering disc brake detail. The application of the yellow paint to the springs appears a little 'rushed' - an easy rectification for the most discerning of modellers, though I'm sure most will leave them be. Opposing corners of the bogies have wheel slip gear fitted, boxes and pipes being picked out in orange paint - an excellent detail that's worthy of note.

The sliding doors are realistic, and the observant modeller might spot the small grab handle, present at the bottom of the doors. Underneath, the steps are well-moulded – crisp, without flash, as are the three-phase electrical sockets. The latter are moulded in orange plastic rather than painted – hardly noticeable, even less so if weathered as per the prototypes.

In summary

Numerous wagons are being produced by smaller manufacturers for current-scene modellers, which makes modelling the present day more achievable for the average modeller. Hornby has delivered a suite of excellent new coaches to complement its already available HST power cars, and with the Mk. 3 conversions being recent, it's likely these vehicles will last beyond the next decade, perhaps seeing yet more liveries? A highly-recommended set of models.



BACHMANN **HKA BOGIE HOPPER**

▼ vidence of Bachmann Europe's move models is emerging. These newly-tooled HKA bogie hopper wagons, simultaneously available in OO and N scale under Bachmann Branchline and Graham Farish labels, were announced in January 2019 and are now reaching retailers.

The HKA hopper is a derivation of the JMA hopper wagon of the mid-nineties built for National Power's transportation of coal and limestone to Drax Power Station. The casual observer will note that there's a similarity to the HHA hopper, which was a later batch built for Freightliner. From 2002, selected JMA wagons were re-coded to HKA with subsequent conversion to outer (HKA-O) and inner (HKA-I) wagons and new bogies with most of the work being carried out by Marcroft in Stoke. From this point, the wagons were solely categorised for coal transport.

In the early 1990s, National Power was developing plans to run its own coal trains to Drax Power Station. Trials had taken place during the autumn of 1992 using Tiphook KPA bogie hopper wagons. To realise its plans, National Power ordered five locomotives along with a batch of 85 hopper wagons. The first wagons were delivered in May 1995 and they soon received the TOPS code JMA. In 1998, National Power sold its rail operations to national freight operator

EWS. While much of the fleet was stored out of service, in early-2009, those JMAs that were still in service were fitted with new bogies, receiving the TOPS code HKA. As is often the case with freight stock, the wagons were not repainted and many still carried National Power branding. In more recent years, DB Schenker, faced with a shortage of hopper wagons, began a programme to refurbish several of the JMAs that were previously in storage.

For both the Branchline and Farish versions of this product, each wagon can be modeled as an outer or inner wagon. An outer wagon has the rectangular buffer, drawbar hook and screw-link coupling, while the inner end of an outer wagon has

a buckeye coupling and buckeye coupling lever (in white). The detailing pack also includes the appropriate air and main reservoir pipes and a cosmetic tail lamp. The fitting of these is straightforward, dependent on coupling clearances, in both scales enabling the modeller to create the appropriate formations.

There is plenty of captivating detail on the wagons, especially below solebar level and underneath. Aside from compromises for tooling, there's little difference in the level of detail in each scale, which is a compliment to the N scale product. The later DB Schenker livery, as worn by our Farish review sample, from 2014 onwards (when a further batch were converted by Axiom Rail including an additional UIC number for Mountsorrel Quarry aggregate traffic) gives them more widespread network use.

The decoration of both wagons is typical of Bachmann's high standard, especially the National Power livery, which is available in pristine and de-branded weathered versions in both scales. There is an anomaly in pricing between the different versions, with the National Power examples being slightly higher. This has arisen from a coding issue between Bachmann and the factory, which should have related to weathered versions. The weathered effect is achieved by the use of faded paint tones rather than additional layering, and is a very pleasing interpretation.

With the multitude of Class 66 locomotives now available, there can't be a shortage of customers who fancy a rake of large hoppers to hang behind them, surely?

IRM 42FT FLAT **SPOIL WAGONS**

rish Railway Models continues the development of its 'Project 42' wagons based on the same platform as its preceding fertilizer and keg wagons.

It's not just Network Rail that utilises yellow as a livery for infrastructure workings. These bright yellow wagons were converted from earlier 42ft bogie platforms to create dedicated spoil wagons to work on infrastructure trains. Such services have been seen across the IE system for almost 10 years now. A total of 24 wagons were converted at Limerick Works to replace the aging former barytes wagons on this duty and they debuted in traffic in September 2011. Footage can be seen of lengthy rakes on re-ballasting work for the delivery of new or cleaned stone and removal from the site of waste ballast. Loading and unloading is carried out via plant equipment rather than having any discharge facilities.

Four twin-packs of wagons are available from Irish Railway Models website, each with different wagon numbering and markings and two 20ft spoil containers, again with different numbers and markings to make up a lengthy eight-wagon rake, usually found behind an 071 Class locomotive or occasional 201 Class, but more often found in a yard for loading or unloading.

The decoration is up to the usual high standard, but in common with virtually every other yellow wagon on the market, regardless of country of origin, the main

body can look a little plasticky and really needs a touch of weathering to take that cleanliness away. On the outer end of the container, there is a removable run-off guard to save loose ballast accumulating on the ends of the wagons, although most footage of the wagons seems to show the guard absent. In addition to this, a triangular raised guard channels stray spoil into one container or the other. These wagons feature a high specification including sprung buffers, close coupling mechanism with optional coupling bars, rotating axle bearing caps and intricate detail for the rodding and linkages on the underside of the wagon.

Hidden gems

As ever, all of the detail is accurate and well-executed, with the detail beneath the underframe comprising pipe runs and gear linkages being particularly pleasing, even if they will be rarely seen. The axle ends feature rotating axle boxes as with the flat wagons. As the width of the bogies is dimensionally accurate, there is capacity to fit scale-width axles and wheelsets for those modelling the network in accurate 5ft 3in gauge. Further detailing is provided in the pack with a choice of tension-lock or rigid bar couplings to mount into the NEM pockets, vacuum brake pipes for the bufferbeam, and the locking bar mechanism for each end of the sides if there is sufficient bogie clearance on layout curves.

Priced at €100.00 for a pair, the models are available directly from irishrailwaymodels.com, the price reflecting the lower quantity production runs, which are appropriate to the smaller Irish marketplace. Soon to arrive, utilising the same 42ft platform, will be the weedspraying train sets - they look really appealing!



IRM WAGON **ACCESSORY PACKS**

mentioned in the reviews of IRM's fertilizer and keg wagons (BRM August . 2020) that it would be useful to see the fitted loads available separately. These accessories are of wider use than just those modelling the Irish scene and could be utilised imaginatively.

The recently reviewed Guinness keg wagons included five differently-numbered crates with removable stacks of kegs. The kegs aren't branded, so could usefully form containers for beer of your choice in modern brewery scenes or dray loads.

Córas Iompair Éireann uses a standard 20ft container for the transportation of

equipment and materials, which can be found on engineering trains and lorries, but more usually around yards for storage. Never mind that you don't model the Irish scene, a couple of these could be used around any industry or business for storage, suitably repainted – a different touch with their side-opening doors.

The fertilizer wagons contained stacks of palleted bags and the pack features six stacks, four large and two smaller loads, which could be used creatively around any business producing or using bagged loads of construction materials or as transport loads.

EFE RAIL CLASS 17

he Class 17 'Clayton' is arguably one of the most distinctive diesels that appeared on the network with its central cab, all round windows and low bonnets. Their profile and interest extends way beyond their former operational area of the North East and Scotland. It has been an absentee from the range of N gauge locomotives for too long and it's sure to have some appreciative purchasers.

The EFE Rail brand brings less widely available models to the majority of retailers' shelves through Bachmann's nationwide distribution, although the Clayton hadn't

yet been produced. Originally designed for DJ Models, the vendor in China possessed a partially-developed project. Kernow Model Rail Centre secured its production, to be distributed via the EFE Rail brand. The aim is to bring quality collectable models to modellers and this project provides something that might not have otherwise materialised.

There's a new style of packaging to look for on the shelves now in the smart dark and pale blue design. The 'Clayton' arrives in a strong Farish-like acetate box with foam surround giving good protection. Unboxing

the model, the initial impression is how well the shape has been captured overall and it scales out accurately against drawings.

The two-tone green livery always looked well on the 'Clayton', naturally suiting the locomotive's distinctive lines. Our review model of D8594 carries it well, with small yellow warning panels, as introduced in July, 1964, and allocated to Gateshead shed through to 1971; by which time it would have been repainted into corporate blue livery.

The type was designed by Clayton Equipment Company in the Derbyshire

village of Tutbury, with D8500-D8587 manufactured there between September 1962 and February 1965, and the balance of the 117 locomotives, D8588-D8616, manufactured by Beyer Peacock in Manchester under sub-contract between March 1964 and April 1965. Due to the central cab design, the locomotive was powered by two Paxman engines apart from D8586/7, the last of the Tutbury batch, which received Rolls-Royce engines. The Clayton-manufactured locomotives were initially allocated to Polmadie and Haymarket sheds, and the Beyer Peacock batch were allocated to Thornaby, Gateshead and Tinsley and the final locomotive, D8616 to Barrow Hill. Later years saw wider allocations to include Carlisle Kingmoor. Preston Division and Barrow Hill.

Reliability woes

Although I feel the locomotives looked the part, they had a disappointing operational life. British Railways placed faith in this as its future Type 1 unit with improved visibility beyond the pilot scheme locomotives. Poor engine reliability and reduced local freight workings hastened their withdrawal by 1971. One locomotive, D8568, survived into industrial use with Ribblesdale at Clitheroe, before entering preservation in 1982. Often seen in pairs to give Type 2 performances and capabilities, the 'Claytons' offer a time stamp for a layout based in the North East of England or southern half of Scotland.

Up close

The shape and dimensions are very good. However, the model starts to fall down a little with the exaggerated definition of the engine compartment doors, gaps above and below the exhaust assembly between the cab windows, the smoothed edges of the tablet

catcher equipment recess and the slightly too short 'toolboxes' on the running plate. Most of these are the result of looking at the model under great magnification and they don't offend from normal viewing distances with the naked eye. At least the detail is visible. One element that does jar at normal viewing distance, however, is the headcode glazing. Owing to the bevelling, or shape of the glazing, this gives a rounded appearance, creating the illusion that the train identifier blinds are on a cylinder.

Accessories galore

There is an amazing detailing pack with the model, including everything from snowploughs, to buffer beam detailing with lamp irons (which I found difficult to fit) and end steps, which can be fitted if your curves are sufficiently relaxed. How far the modeller wants to go is down to them, but it's a rewarding challenge.

What is simple and commendable is the easy unclipping of the fuel tank beneath the cab to access the Next18 decoder socket, making DCC fitting less than a minute task.

However, I have been unable to get inside the body to identify if there is space to fit a speaker and how the motor and gearing is

On test, the model performs very well, capably managing eight Mk. 1 coaches smoothly and with little motor or gear noise. The directional lighting of headcodes and tail lamps is good, if perhaps a little bright on DC at normal train speeds.

The launch products include both green- and blue-liveried models suited to both Scottish and English Regions in both pristine and nicely-weathered versions, plus the Ribble Cement industrial livery. The execution of all elements within the livery is commendably precise.

Although I have expressed some points, there is nothing that would stop me buying one if I were in the market for it; Kernow and EFE rail are to be applauded for including this within their launch range.

The fine wheels with pinpoint axle contacts can be seen along with the decoder socket once the fuel tank is unclipped.



EFE RAIL J94 'AUSTERITY'

his J94/Hunslet Austerity model was originally released in 2016 by DJ Models. With the liquidation of that business in 2019, the tooling, which was still owned by the factory in China, has been used by Kernow Model Rail Centre to produce additional models that will be distributed to Bachmann stockists under a new brand, known as EFE Rail. An initial selection of BR, industrial and military liveries has been produced, including the attractive Longmoor Military Railway livery, the previous version of which sold quickly.

This is the same model, with all of its strengths retained and some of its weaknesses addressed. The inclusion of a better-quality coreless motor and a different circuit board offers the ease of a Next18 decoder socket, which can be accessed by opening the smokebox door.

Significant permutations within the tooling allow for many variants to be produced to cover the main line and industrial locomotives with the potential for different bunker styles, cab spectacle windows, chimney styles, smokebox doors and steps. The models in the launch of the EFE Rail range have the same style of

bunker, cab windows and chimney. The BR-liveried 68075 has central steps to the running plate in front of the centre driving wheels.

Our review model is that of an NCBowned locomotive from Comrie Colliery, halfway between Alloa and Dunfermline in Fife. It's a striking livery, which was carried until 1982. It's distinctive and makes me wonder if someone had tried to paint it in the style of an NCB lorry with a yellow cab. Yellows on models can look insipid or plasticky, but there is a good density to all areas, with a fine reproduction of No. 19 on both bufferbeams. The bufferbeams have holes for pipe fittings, though this locomotive had no train braking, so the modeller could fill these. The only significant detail difference of No. 19 is the trapezoidal plating to the rear face of the bunker and removal of the top lip. It's not something we could expect the tooling to cater for.

An inherited visual weakness of the model is the overly thick ejector pipe, which is moulded with the cab steps. Removal and replacement with wire would improve its appearance.

On test, the model exhibits a little gear and motor noise but runs smoothly after running-in over a variety of pointwork. Reports from some users of the original DJM model identified a problem where play in the gear drive could lead to uneven running on downward slopes when a tail load exerted force on the locomotive. I've tried to replicate the issue over slopes from 1 to 5 degrees with varying train loads and have not been able to reproduce the issue with the EFE model. Hopefully, the improved coreless motor has overcome this weakness. For future reference, a handy way to distinguish any chassis between the two production runs is that either 'Kernow' or 'DJ Models' is printed on the chassis beneath the cab door.

Overall, the fact that the use of the original tooling has been secured is a good thing because there are many more permutations and liveries that could be produced in the near future. Recommended.

HOW ARE THE FIGURES MADE?

Modelu figures are 3D scanned from real people and 3D printed using a high resolution resin printer.

DO THE FIGURES NEED CLEANING?

The figures have been cleaned in isopropyl using an ultrasonic cleaner to remove any uncured resin from the prints. If there is a slight tackiness to the prints, this can be removed by carefully washing the figure in warm water and washing up liquid.

ARE THE FIGURES PAINTED?

The figures are not paitned, details of painting services are on the next pages, 8-9.

WHAT TOOLS ARE NEEDED?

Before the figures can be painted the 3D printing support sprues need removing.

EILEEN'S EMPORIUM have put together a handy tool kit for this task including the following tools:

- SIDE CUTTERS for thin, medium and thick diameter supports.
- TWEEZERS or SCALPEL for fine supports.
- SANDING STICKS for cleaning up sprue marks.

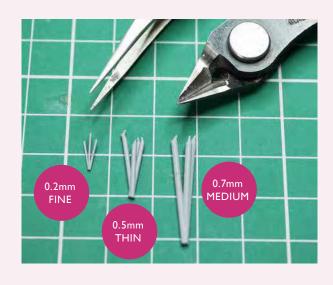
TYPES OF SPRUE

- FINE 0.2mm diameter used for very fine details on N, OO and O gauge figures
- THIN 0.5mm diameter for detail on OO and fine detail on O gauge figures. Also used to attach N and OO figures to the base
- MEDIUM 0.7mm diameter for detail on O to 1/32nd figures
- THICK 1mm diameter for attaching O figures to the base

preparing your figures







removing sprues







Using a pair of flat sided cutters, carefully remove the support sprues, leaving the base sprues intact. The sprues can either be removed from the tip, or sniped at the base and prised away using the cutters or your fingers.



Medium and thin sprues can also carefully be removed using your fingers.



GAUGE

Fine sprues can be prised away using a pair of tweezers or a scalpel.



Base supports can be kept on to assist with clamping when painting. Remove from the base using a pair of side cutters.



Any marks left by sprues can be cleaned up using a sanding stick or scalpel



If required the base of the feet can be sanded flat with a sanding stick.
