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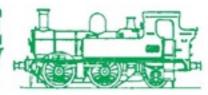












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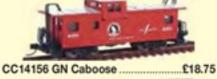

This range includes many passenger multiple units that run around Europe, not just in Germany. this allows interesting commuter and inter-urban layouts to be modelled if they are based around a specific locomotive.

Music legend **Jools Holland OBE** unveils his extensive layout which features scenes in Europe as well as locations in Britain. Steve Flint reports.

The 'big city' area of the European section includes structures old and new, such as the Museum of Moderne Kunst in Berlin, which features a changing programme of exhibitions, a (much reduced) model of Cologne cathedral, and the Alexander Column from St.Petersburg (bought as a souvenir from The Hermitage gift shop while on tour), around which is a thriving market scene (arranged by my daughter Mabel). The train at the Hauptbahnhof is hauled by a BR184 Pacific.

However, he does have a refuge. Up a curved staircase at the back of his house and through a magical door lies a wonderful world of miniature escapism, a place where he can steal away from the pressures of the real world.

"Fortunately," he says, "there isn't a very good 'phone signal in here."

A series of independent circuits of track link the different tableaux to create an amazing scenic vista over 100' long. About one third of this is devoted to European scenes. (The British section is covered in detail in the January 2019 issue of RAILWAY MODELLER.)

A visitor to this special place might be struck by a strange sense of déjà vu, because the title sequence of the programme was filmed here, with the man himself dropped into the pictures.



I am fortunate to have a comparatively large layout that gives great pleasure to myself, my family, and my friends. Like many others, as a boy I began with a modest train set in the corner of a small room in a small house. This progressed, step by step, to the 100' layout featured here.

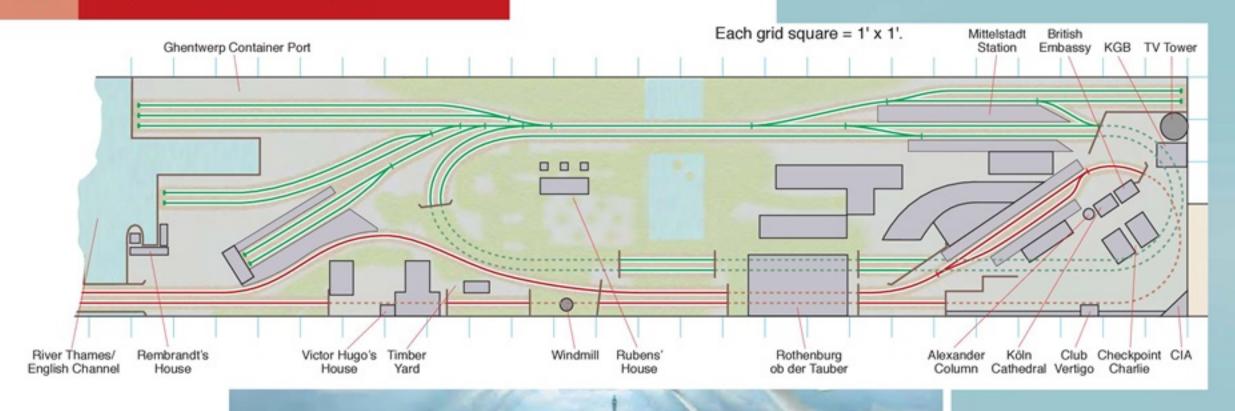
It had been a longstanding ambition of mine to have a layout that could feature British and European sections connected by the Eurostar. I enjoy touring and performing in Europe, where the German, Dutch, and Flemish cities, their landscapes, industry, and paintings have been my chief inspiration.

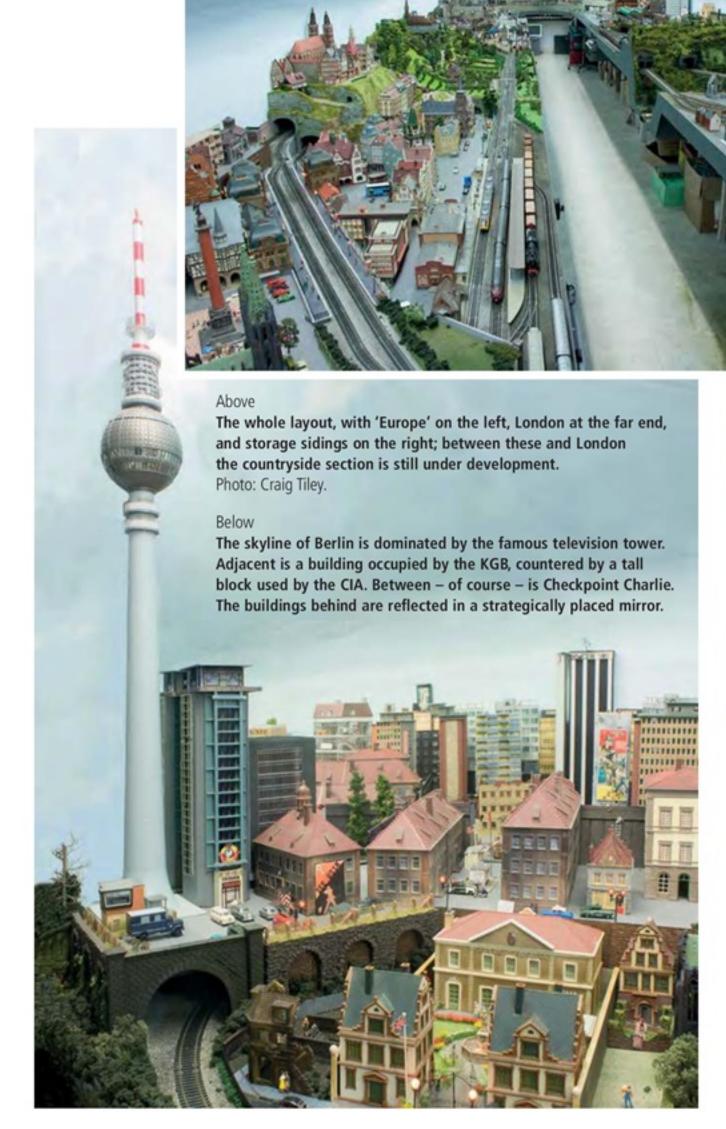
Even the biggest layouts have to be compressed, so my plan to put a large chunk of Europe into one section (25') of a room has been ambitious. It has been enormously entertaining and I hope that the viewer will get as much pleasure in looking at the pictures as we have making it.

I am always inspired and delighted to see the layouts featured in Continental Modeller and Rallway Modeller, so I am now particularly honoured that they have seen fit to feature mine in this month's issues.

Thanks to the wizardry of digital special effects, Jools is seen leaving a house in old London, leaping aboard a tram, dashing through the Euston arch, taking a precarious ride on the roof of a Eurostar train, *Mission Impossible* style, and driving a vintage Jaguar at speed, pursued by the police, before arriving at the studio.

On the occasion of our visit, however, his warm and friendly welcome bore little resemblance to this panic as he took us on a tour of his miniature world, which stretches from the architectural wonders of a lost London to a rendition of 1960s Cold War Berlin.

He revealed that his inspiration came from old photographs and paintings as well as his own experience.

"To my mind, a model of a real place creates a personal take on history. Photos can provide the stimulus but cannot evoke that special atmosphere in the way that models can."

At 50' x 14' the railway room is unquestionably an area that many enthusiasts can only dream of, and certainly one which would take most a lifetime to fill. Jools' work-life balance is such that he has had to recruit some assistance.

"If I'd have built the baseboards," he says wryly, "they would have collapsed by now. If I'd have attempted to install the lighting, I would have electrocuted myself, and the sky



The layout has taken almost ten years to get to this stage. An early attempt was dismantled. After various trials and errors, the original sky backscene was extended full height and the lighting relocated to the central ridge of the room. Daylight balanced tubes, which take up to ten minutes to warm up properly, are used behind a fascia to illuminate the layout areas.

At night, the city lights and illuminated interiors can be appreciated. Jools is indebted to his friend Mike Chaplin for all the foundation works. "The boards are all over 4'6" wide, and have to be strong enough to support our weight as we reach across to the far corners."

Only when all these foundations were in place could construction commence. Jools admits "We didn't start with a grand track plan of any description. It just evolved as we went along."



He experimented with gradients, but found that they just did not work, and abandoned them in favour of several circuits of level track. "I do enjoy tinkering, but if I can't get something to work, I prefer to move on to something else."

Control units and hand-held throttles are by Morley Controllers of Southport.

Initial sections of track were laid using Hornby components, but the vast majority is Peco and was installed by Vernon Smith and Kerry-Anne Hollands of Invicta Models of Sidcup.

"Vernon, who has been looking into the possibility of converting the long upper loop to DCC, has worked in several model shops in my area for many years. I agree entirely with making the best use of one's local model shop if possible. For many years I used W&H Models in New Cavendish Street, now long gone. It's real a travesty of modern times that central London doesn't have a model shop any more."

The datum height for the baseboards is set at 36" above floor level. "Some might say that's a bit low," Jools suggests, "but it is perfect for sitting in a small chair and watching the trains go by." The underground station is at 28" and the upper loops at 39". "This is ideal to enable the scenery to stretch up and away into the distance."

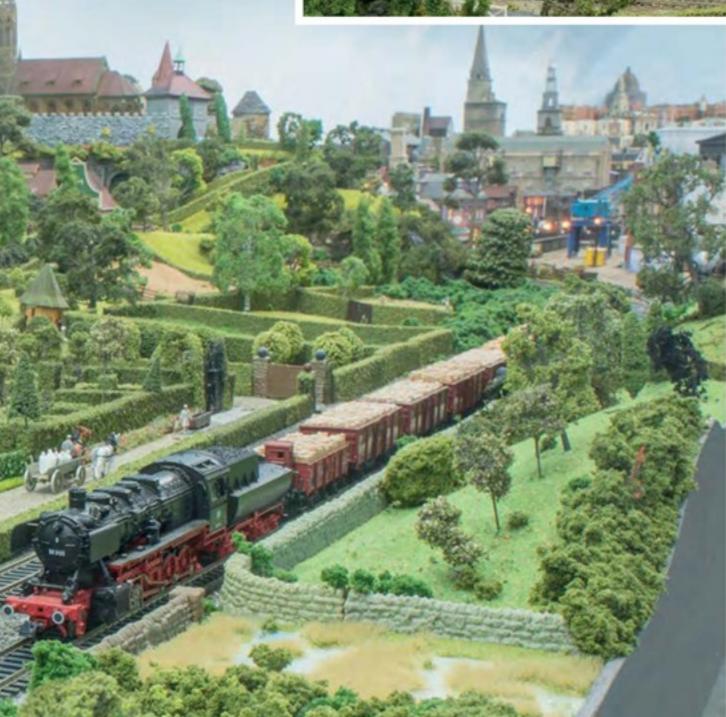

Importantly, all the scenic sections are removable for maintenance and access purposes, and most of the completed models have been fitted with internal lighting thanks to Tom Walkinshaw aided by Jools.

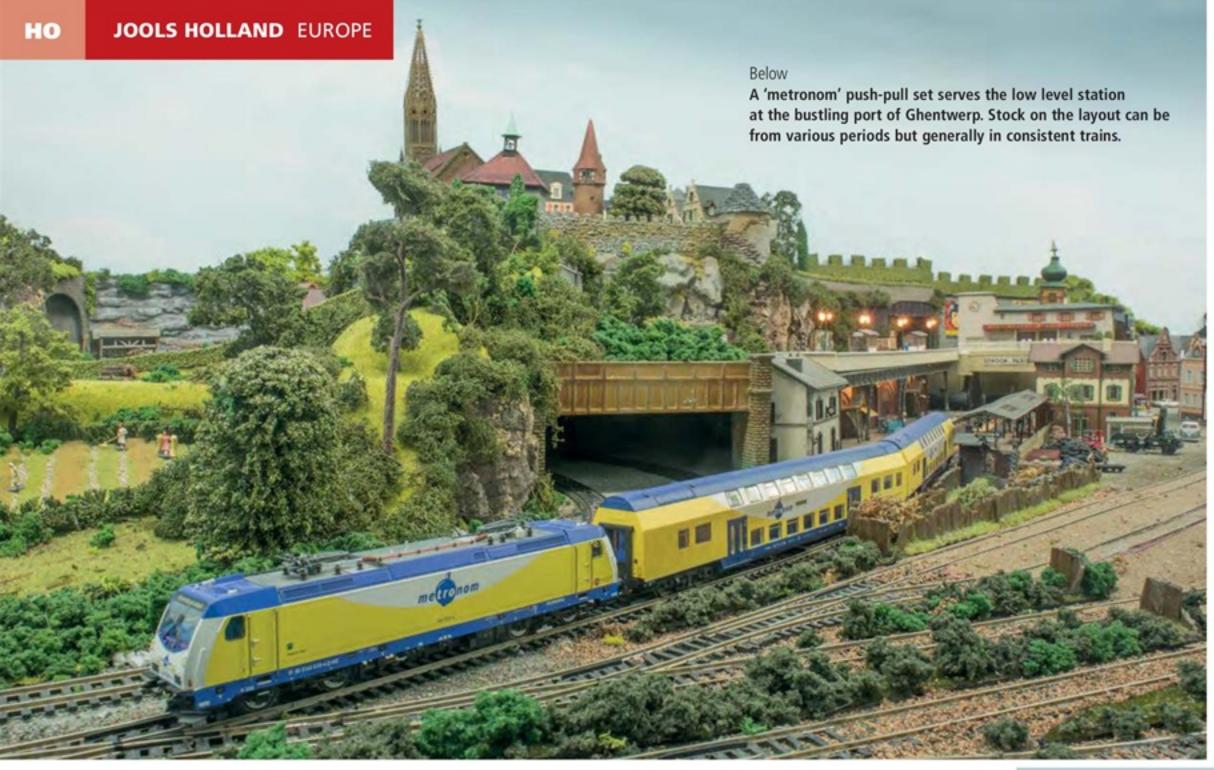
Jools admits there is still lots of detailing work to be done. Whenever he gets time to slip quietly away into this alternative universe, he spends much of the early part of the session doing some modelling before settling down with a glass of wine to run a few trains with some music playing gently in the background.

'Staffage by Another Hand' is an expression used to describe old master paintings where more than one artist has worked on a picture: one would paint the landscape, another the figures. Family and friends, for the purposes of their own amusement, will sometimes in Jools' absence place figures in different scenes around the layout – Staffage by Another Hand.

If he has one tip to pass on, he says the best way to clean all that track is to run trains as regularly as possible. He has a lot of tunnels on this layout, so that is probably good advice.

One large loop runs at high level around the entire layout. This links London via the Channel to Europe. Both the River Thames and the Channel are represented by the same stretch of water, and the connection is a bridge rather than a tunnel.





Beyond the bridge the line runs through depictions of Belgium, The Netherlands, and Germany, culminating in a medley of Berlin in the former East Germany, which features some notorious Cold War establishments such as Checkpoint Charlie and a KGB headquarters. The famous television tower somehow balances the model of the British Post Office Tower at the opposite end of the room. And to add to the atmosphere of life behind the Iron Curtain, there is even a reproduction of the Alexander Column in Palace Square, St.Petersburg, transplanted as a reminder of the power base in mid-twentieth century eastern Europe. It was made using a souvenir from The Hermitage gift shop! Such chance finds, and not always on the trade stands at model railway exhibitions, often prompt Jools to create a scene or a cameo.

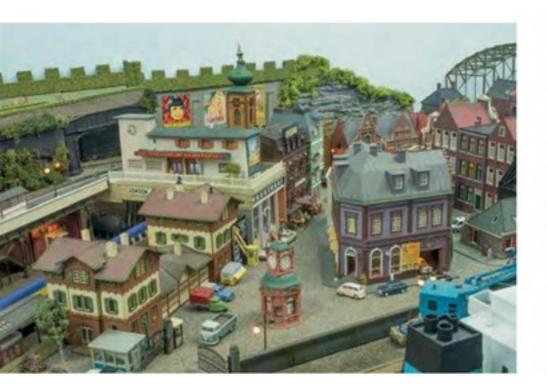
Berlin is set against a mirror backdrop, angled to give the impression of more layout disappearing into the distance.

The wall with the mirror separates the layout proper and Jools' workshop area and modelling bench. All the usual tools and materials can be found around the bench, along with the proverbial scrapbox full of all those useful odds and ends modellers never throw out, lest they are needed the day after they have been discarded! Under the layout, there is a lot more ...

In the German section, Cologne Cathedral takes pride of place – not a full size 1:87 scale model, of course, as that would take up most of the baseboard.

The high level station nearby is actually on the main loop of the layout and sees Eurostar trains from St.Pancras Below

International passing through from time to time. The station building is the well known Kibri kit based on Bonn.

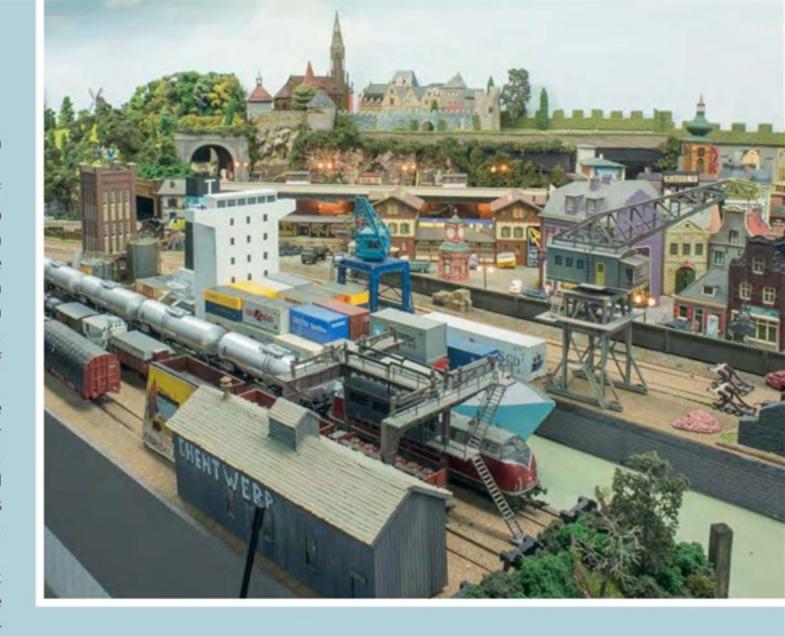
Moving 'west' we pass through scenes depicting parts of Freiburg and Rothenburg in southern Germany, with hilltop walled towns and characteristic half-timbered buildings, then through The Netherlands, including a mansion set in ornate gardens, and the obligatory windmill, and eventually arrive in Belgium at a harbour alongside the water divider which can be the English Channel or the River Thames as appropriate. The European side of the dock scene is the Flemish port of 'Ghentwerp' – a combination of Ghent and Antwerp.

Many of the buildings on the continental section have been acquired from Ruud Van Storm, a structure modeller and supplier from a windswept town on the Dutch coast. Jools notes: "He has a place the size of a warehouse stacked floor to ceiling with continental model buildings. Buildings are all that he does, and it's great that people like him exist. It makes this hobby all the more fascinating."

Jools explained that operating sessions are often split between the two halves of the layout. When running the European section, the top loop would be used for continental trains which would disappear down the line and across the 'Channel' leaving the entire British section to act as a huge fiddle yard. "When you are operating the European section your back is usually to the British section, so you don't see the incongruity of German or Dutch trains travelling through old London, apart from the Golden Arrow or the Eurostar."

Adjacent to the docks at Ghentwerp, this is the Channel; on the other side it represents the River Thames at Greenwich. The quay is fringed with typical Dutch gable fronted houses, most of which were acquired from Ruud Van Storm. Beyond the lifting bridge, the taller building with the triangular pediment is Rembrandt's house from Amsterdam.

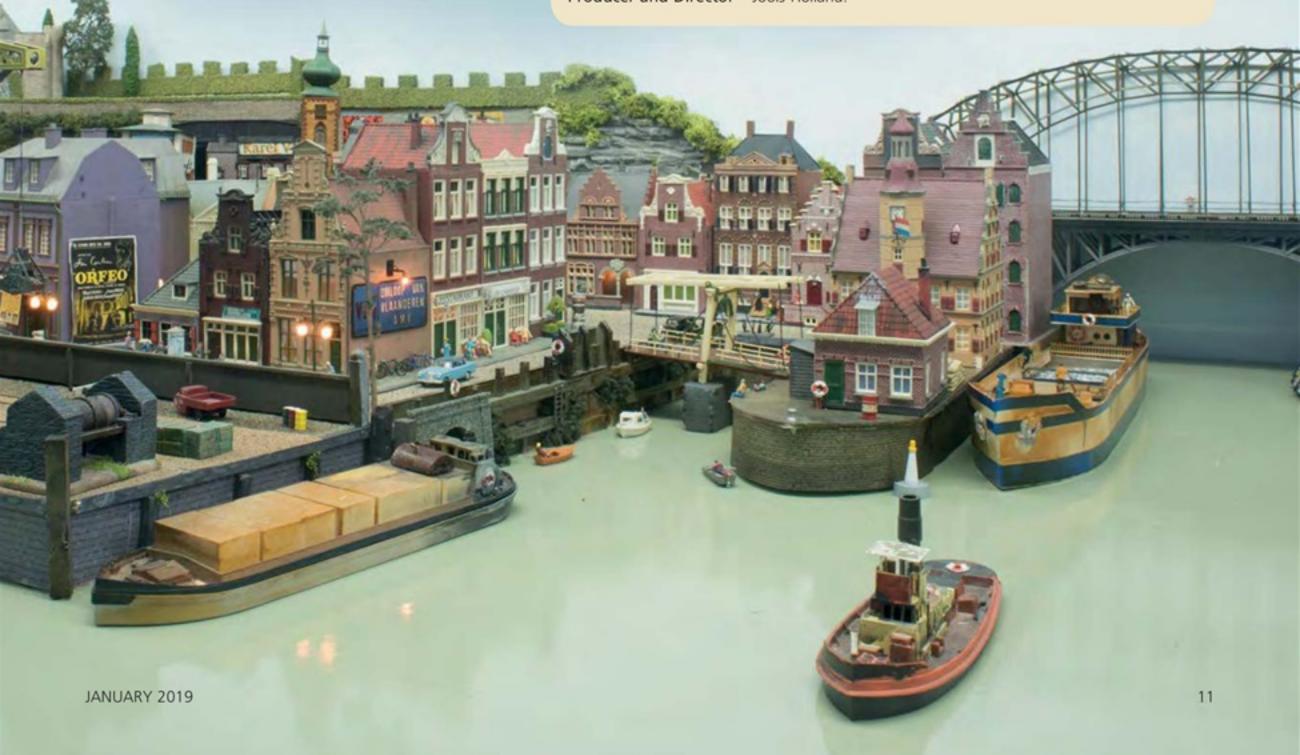

Carrière du Canal

A 600mm gauge industrial line

am actually a very keen Gauge 1 modeller but I wanted to do something in a really small area which would be portable enough to take to exhibitions without compromising the 1:32 scale, and this is the result.

The whole idea is a stone crushing company using a narrow gauge railway to take stones from a quarry (not seen) to the crushing plant. The resulting small stone is then transported to the customers by canal. This fictional story is set around 1990.

The baseboard measures 175cm x 80cm and is made of 45mm x 10mm pine and 3.6mm three-ply to keep the weight low. The visible part is about 53cm deep.

The track and points are HO, from Tillig, but with the plastic sleeper base cut apart to increase the distance between the sleepers. Using 16.5mm is a compromise, of course, as in 1:32 scale a 600mm gauge Feldbahn should be 18.75mm.

The ballast was made of real little stones.

The landscape was made from hard foam insulation sheets, as used in the construction of buildings. The road embankment was made with Sculptamold, a water/paperbased material. The bridge abutment wall was also made of insulation foam, with the bricks cut into the surface and coloured one by one.

The road was made with white sand glued with white woodworking glue and painted black.

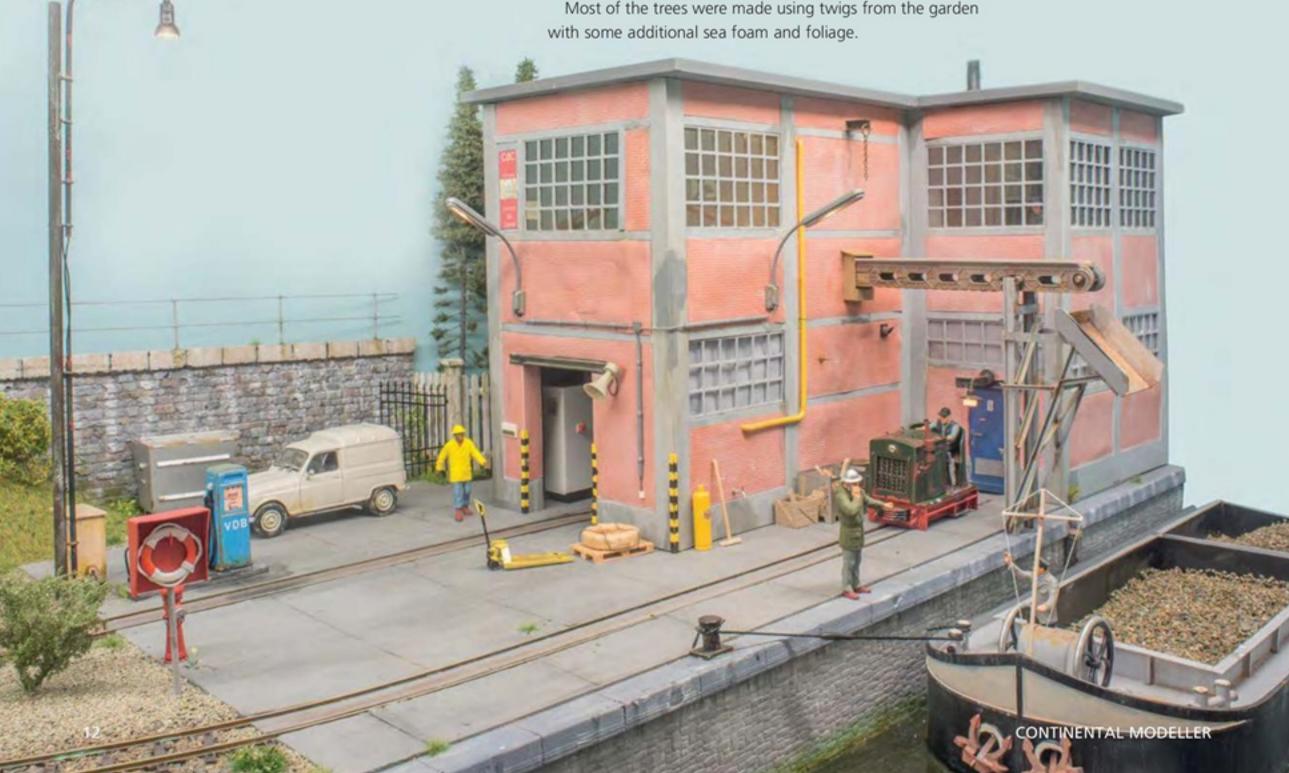


Arriving from the quarry, the new diesel with a cab only just fits under the bridge.

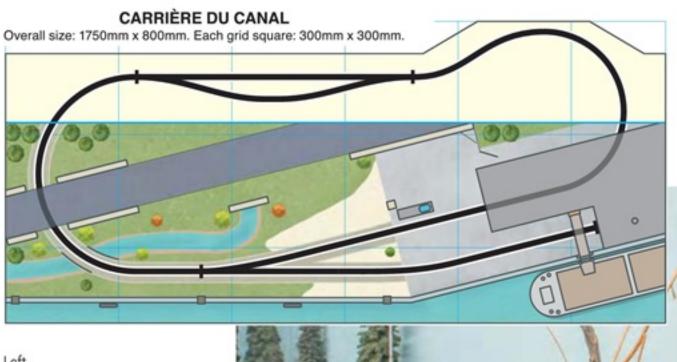

The locomotives were built using the chassis, with motor and wheels, from an HO DB Köf four-wheel diesel shunter, equipped with an ESU Loksound decoder. The bodywork was completely scratchbuilt of plasticard, with some wood, and fly screen mesh for the radiator grille. The air intake on the bonnet is a part from a ballpoint pen.

Loaded skips are run into the building for emptying, and the stone is carried by conveyor belt to barges for onward transport. The siding on the quay allows for supplies to be brought in by water and transferred to rail.

The yard is enhanced with details, some borrowed from military modelling. Figures are mostly Preiser.

The layout is operated by a Märklin mobile station digital handset which I obtained very cheaply and find very good.

The barge was also completely made of plasticard, apart from the anchors and the bollards.

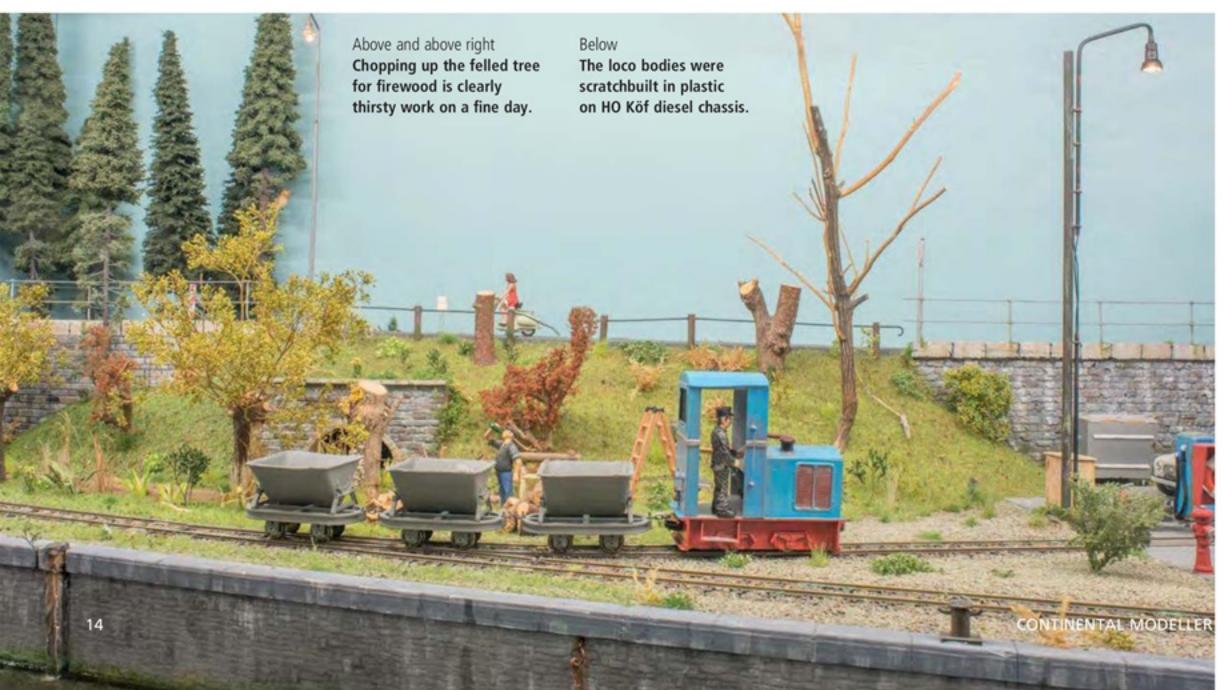
The mooring posts were made from wood carved and distressed with a modelling knife, then painted brown with some washes and then dry brushed.

The stone wall is wallpaper! I found it quite by accident and noticed it had the perfect pattern for this purpose. The original colour was rather bright orange and needed a layer of grey paint and some dry brushing in different colours to tone it down.

The main building was completely made of plasticard, with the roof made of wood.

The water in the canal was made by painting the plywood dark green; when this was dry it got a thick layer of gloss varnish.

The backscene was painted blue to imitate a sunny day. Two fluorescent tubes provide light.



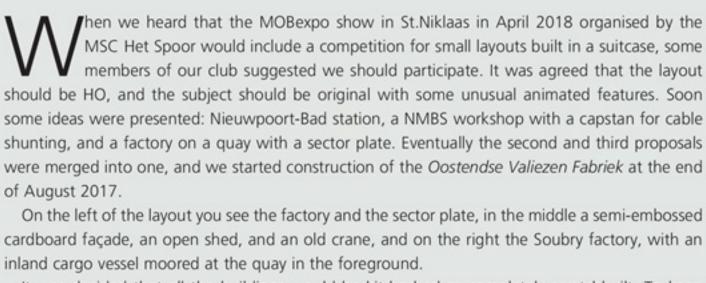

A suitcase packed with technology



It was decided that all the buildings would be kit-bashed or completely scratchbuilt. To keep costs down, as much as possible of the material was re-used from earlier club projects that had fallen into disuse, such as wagons, a pump installation, the crane, vehicles, and figures. For example, the crane, which was designed to span one track, was modified to straddle two tracks.

The larger buildings which border the scene are mostly modelled in low relief, scratchbuilt or adapted to varying degrees from commercial items.

Below

The layout sits in an open suitcase, also using the lid: the competition rules did not require the suitcase to be closed with the whole layout contained within it. The hinge is located under the end of the dock.







The metal doors to the suitcase factory were made from a metal tube of toothpaste. Dents and rivets can easily be formed in this soft, supple, but sturdy material.

The suitcase factory is a background model, i.e. just a façade, which was adapted from a Walthers Cornerstone kit (ref.933-3189). The façade was completely cut about, and combined with pieces of brick sheet, plasticard, and architects' cardboard, with only the base of one wall forming a complete building. The building also got a saw-tooth roof.

The sector plate is not long enough for a loco and a bogie van, so the wagon must be winched into the factory.

The Soubry factory was created in a similar way from another Walthers Cornerstone kit (ref.933-2914).

The half-relief façade behind the open shed is a cardboard Scale Model Scenery OO product.

The small administrative office was scratchbuilt and has a detailed interior.

The concrete surface of the site was made of architects' card, and the cobblestones in the streets were impressed one by one. The streets were then painted and weathered. Here and there some weeds were placed between the stones and around the poles.

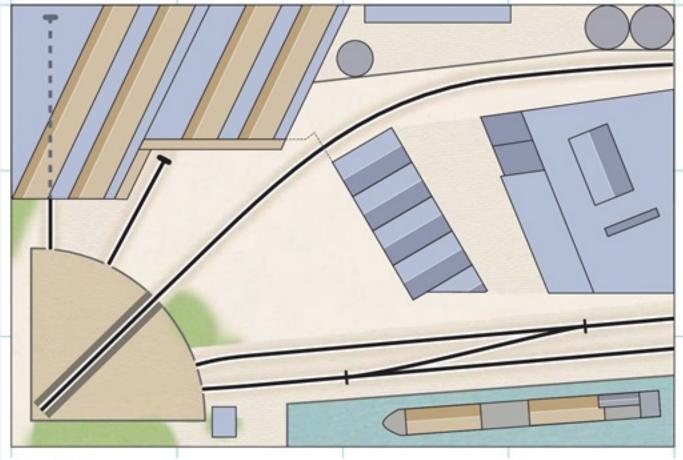
There is no commercial model of a 90° sector plate with five unevenly spaced track connections so this had to be completely scratchbuilt.

All road vehicles are equipped with drivers and authentic number plates. The trucks were also equipped with custom transfers with the factory logo.

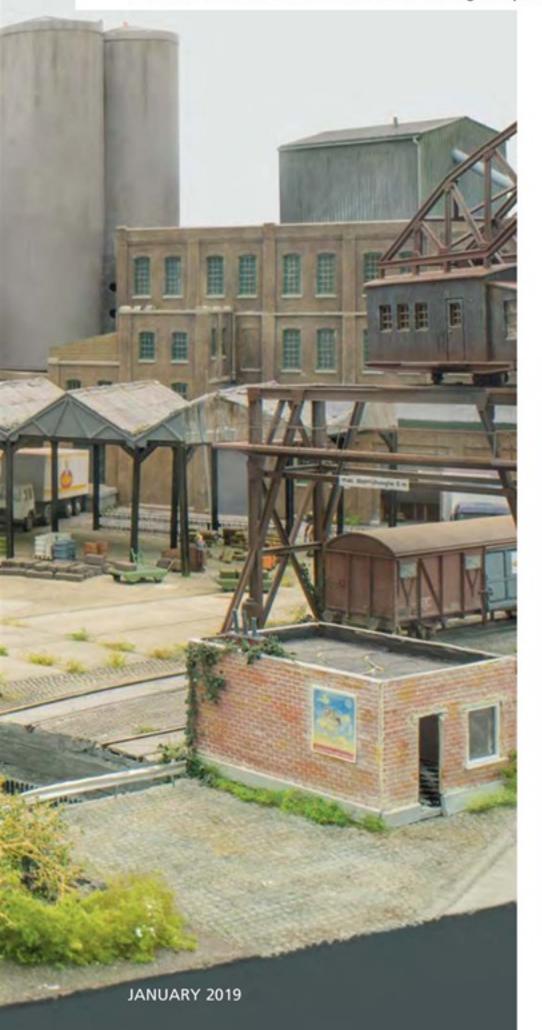
To give the layout some unique features which we hoped would impress the competition judges and the viewing public, we wanted to take on some technical and electronic challenges, such as:

- making the sector plate work;
- a working capstan to draw a long wagon in and out of the suitcase factory without a locomotive (a long wagon and a loco will not fit on the turntable together);
- a gate which would open and close automatically when
 a shunting locomotive entered the industrial area;

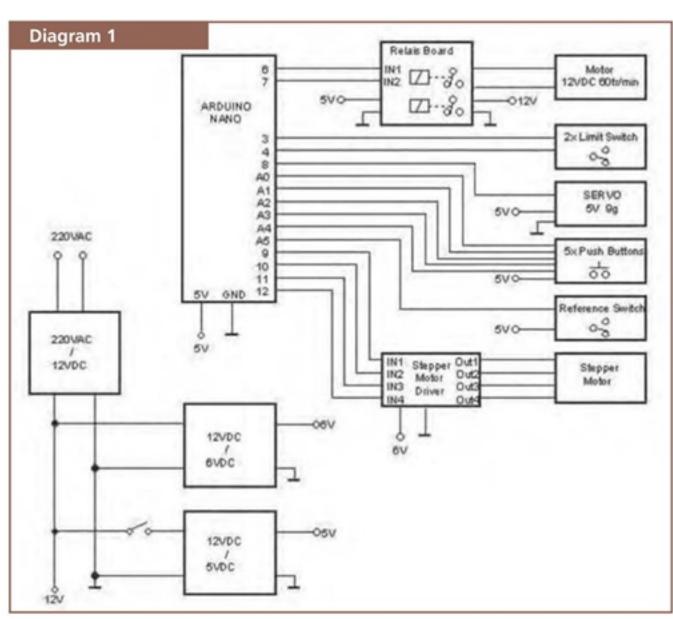
One of the biggest challenges was to refill the barge's hold without this being noticed. It was decided to create an 'underground' transport system, by which the interior hold of the barge can be moved unseen when the deck cover is closed. The hold is initially placed below the silo so it can be filled with the preset quantity of grain. In the next step, the hold is pulled back into the barge; the hold cover can then be opened. A suction arm is lowered into the hold to empty it with vacuum pumps to refill the silos. Then the arm is retracted, the cover closed, and the process can be repeated.

To deal with this, club technicians were put together in a room to brainstorm possible solutions. It was decided to drive everything with Arduino programmable micro-processors. This choice was made quickly because they have many inputs and outputs, both analogue and digital, and everything can be programmed in a simple way. Due to the complexity of the tasks to be performed, two Arduinos were necessary.

We came up with the following solutions.

Arduino 1 must fulfill the following tasks (diagram 1):

- control of the 90° sector plate by means of a stepper motor and one reference switch.
- control of the capstan by a 12volt 60rpm motor and two limit switches.
- open and close the entrance gate by a servo.
- push buttons to select the position of the turntable.



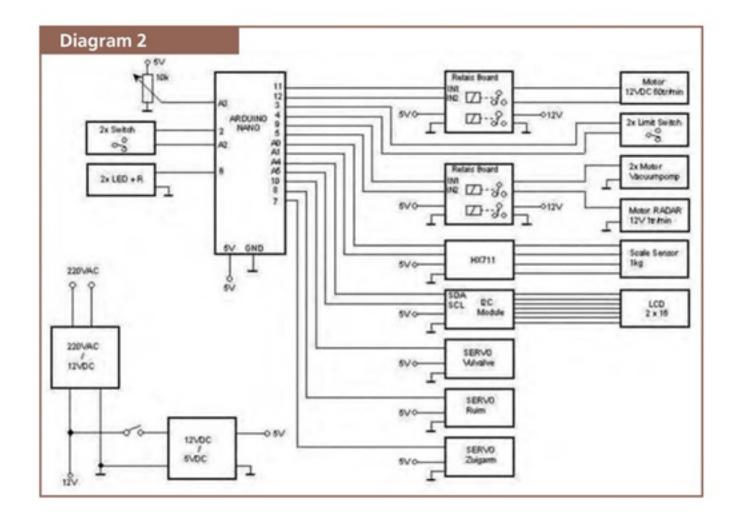

Arduino 2 must fulfill the following tasks (diagram 2):

- open/close the hold cover by means of a servo.
- move the hold interior by a 12volt 60rpm motor, with two infra-red end-of-run sensors.
 - work the valve to fill the hold, controlled by a servo.
- weigh the cargo using a YZC-133 mini load cell and an HX711 24-bit analogue/digital converter.
- power a LCD display to set the desired weight and show the status of the load.



- move the suction arm up and down with a servo.
- empty the hold with two vacuum pumps.
- rotate the barge's radar with a 12volt 60rpm motor.
- flash two LED aircraft warning lights.

The sector plate proved a major challenge. Because of the length, 30cm, it was impossible to mount the stepper motor directly or with gears on the shaft as this would have too much play at the end of the bridge and the position could not be controlled accurately enough to align the tracks. The solution was to have the motor drive a toothed belt on the side of the pit via gears in the bridge. This enabled us to control the bridge very accurately, with up to 11,000 pulses over 90°.

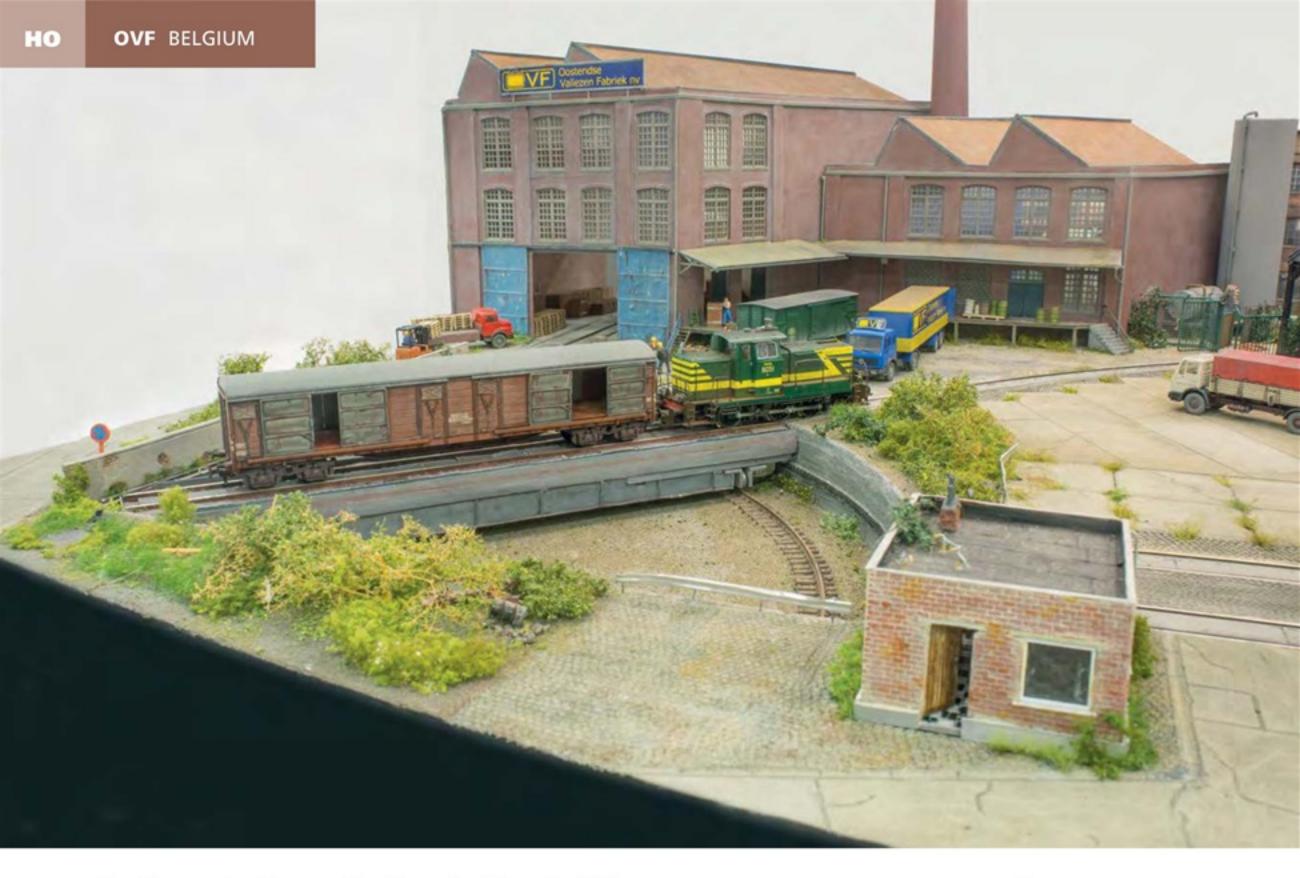
When the layout is powered up for the first time, the first Arduino must know where the bridge is and will therefore go to the reference point first. When the limit switch is pressed, the bridge will stop in position 1 for the suitcase factory. Also on start-up the capstan will bring out the shunter so that he is ready to receive a wagon.

Every time position 3 is selected, the gate will be opened and if a different position is selected the gate will be closed automatically.

The capstan will pull the wagon in after position 1 is selected but the next time it will pull the wagon out. The 12volt motor to move the wagon in and out is controlled by two relays.

When starting up the system, the second Arduino will turn on the aircraft warning lights flashing at a frequency of once each second. The barge's hatch cover will be closed, the





radar will be started, and the set weight will be read and displayed on the LCD screen. The hold interior is moved under the silo and the filling valve is opened, as long as the set weight has not been exceeded. The weight will be measured by the sensor and the HX711 will pass the information to the Arduino. Then the filling valve is closed and the hold is pulled back into the barge. Then the radar will be stopped and the hold cover opened. The suction arm will be lowered and the two vacuum pumps will be started. The arm moves up and down so it can suck up everything properly and not suffer from blockages. After a certain amount of time the arm will go back up and the pumps will be stopped.

Then the sequence can start all over again!

Finishing

A valance was added to carry LED lighting. It was decorated with the factory name and other necessary information.

A three channel sound module by AVT Products was also installed to play background sounds (factory noises and seagulls).

Conclusion

Although railway modelling is not really a competitive sport, we were pleased when our layout achieved third place in the competition, which featured several layouts with quality workmanbarge, ingenious design and construction, and a quite bit of humour!

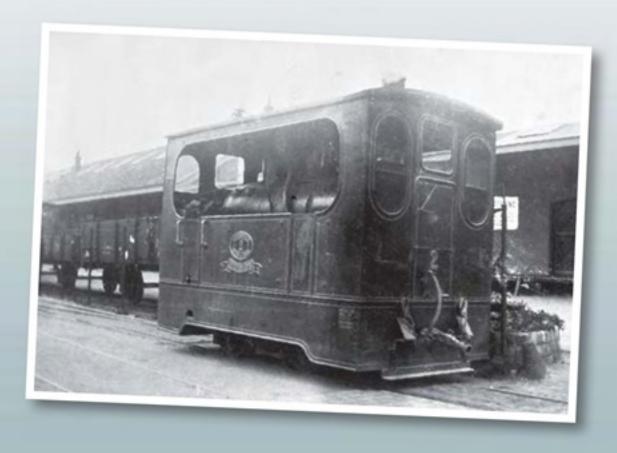

History of the tramway

The Stoomtram Maas en Waal originated from the Nijmeegsche Tramweg Maatschappij (NTM), which operated a tramway in the city of Nijmegen from 1889 to 1913, using horse and then steam traction.

In 1902, a 32km long steam tramway was opened which ran from Nijmegen railway station west to Wamel. The terminus there was close to the river ferry to Tiel. The tramway mostly followed public roads, except for a few kilometres of dedicated so-called 'field track'.

The tramway carried passengers and goods - along the route there were ten loading docks – but it was never very busy.

Layout

In 2003, four members of our club decided to build a model of the Maas en Waal steam tramway and started research in local archives where they found many photos and drawings.

The team decided to build the layout in 1:64 scale (S), which is rather uncommon on the continent, especially in The Netherlands. The main reason for this choice was that standard HO 16.5mm gauge track could be used as it closely approximates the 1,067mm gauge of the tramway.

In 2008 construction of baseboards, buildings, and rolling stock began, but after a while it became clear that the original plans were too ambitious – as they tend to be – so over time there were several simplifications and reductions in size.

When in 2015 the Belgian Modelspoor magazine published the rules for a mini-layout competition to be held in Leuven as part of the Modelspoor Expo in October 2016, this was the opportunity for the team to put together some of the material that had been assembled up to that point and turn it into a compact layout that was suitable for attending exhibitions: the result is Koningswaal, August 1933. Even though the tramway layout was initially intended to be a scale model of sections of the actual track, Koningswaal is a fictional village, but made up using mostly original buildings from different locations along the tramway.

The layout depicts a quaint part of the village, where the tramway enters from the field track between the butcher's and the lawyer's villa. Immediately after crossing Koningsstraat (King Street) we find the tram stop at the edge of the village.

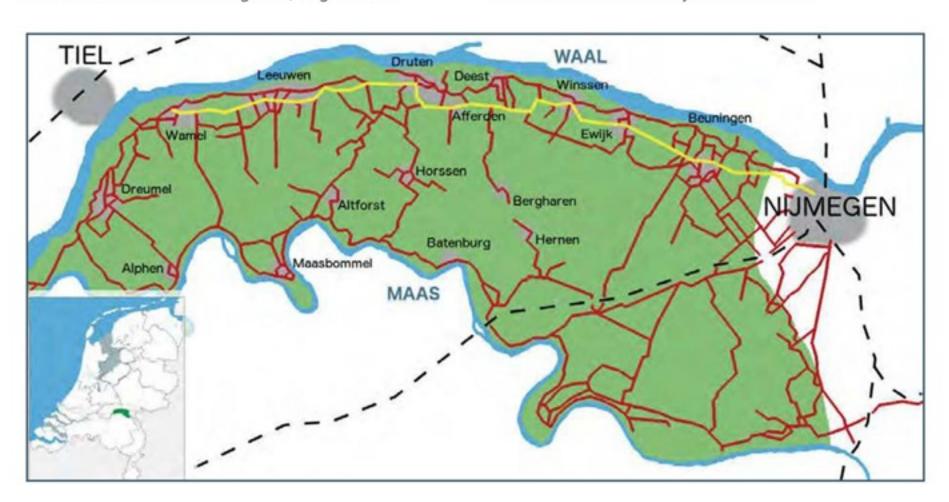
Koningsstraat is a medieval road built on the remains of an old Roman road which ran all the way towards Britain along what was then the border of the empire.

The small house for the stationmaster and a goods loading dock complete the scene.

It is very quiet at this time of year, as it is harvest season and everyone is helping out on the land, so there are not many passengers on the tram. In fact this has always been the case.

Nobody knew at the time that steam tram operations would be discontinued only six months later.

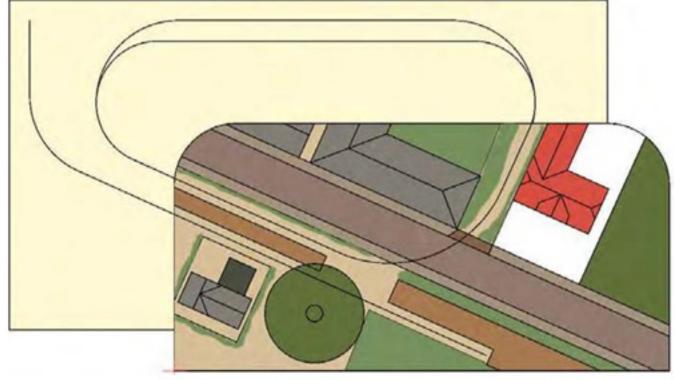

All the buildings were made from Slater's brick plasticard, styrene sheet, and strip. Originally two buildings were made of paper and cardboard but they were replaced with styrene versions before the layout appeared at OntraXS! in 2017.

The pavements and paving around the villa were put together using some 30,000 individual Juweela bricks. The street surface was embossed into foamboard, peeling off one side and using only the core polyurethane material.

The large oak tree in the foreground was made by the stranded wire method.

The hand cart and horse-drawn tree trunk carrier were scratchbuilt in styrene and wood.

Rolling stock

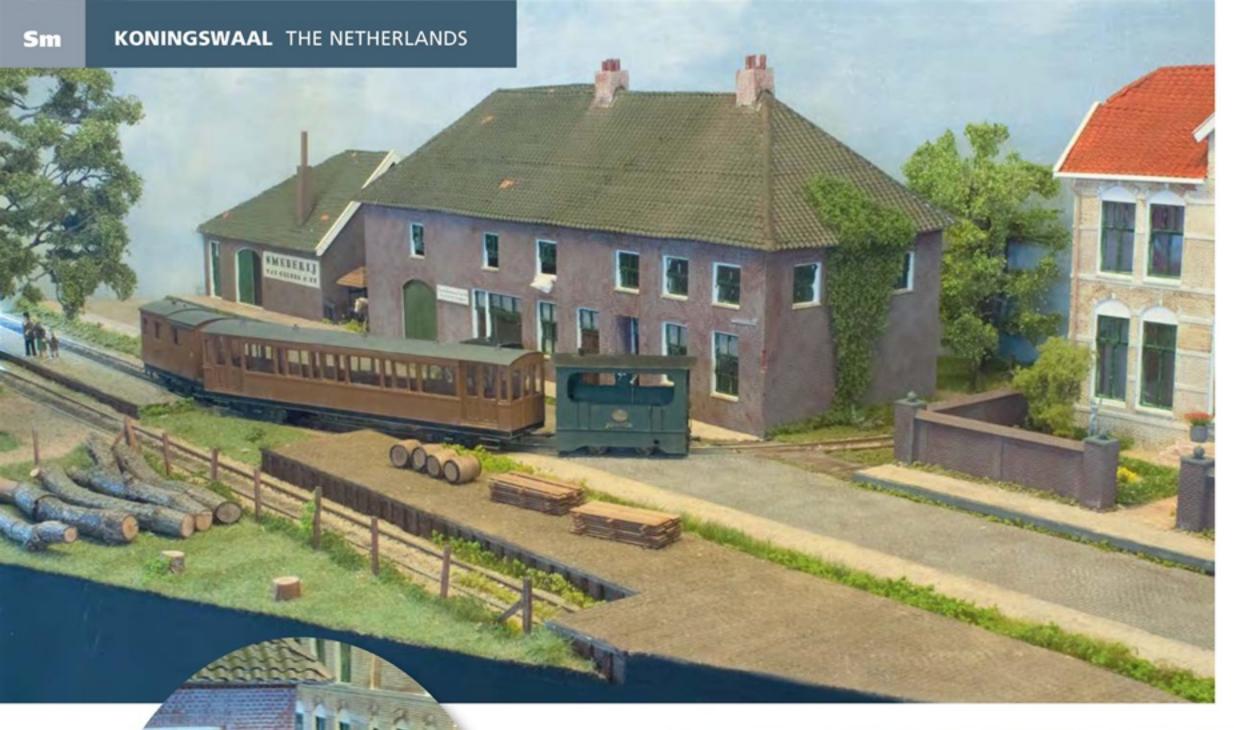
The Stoomtram Maas en Waal had five locomotives, built by Backer & Rueb in 1901. These were more powerful than the standard type, as there were some steep sections around Nijmegen. In 1920 two Hanomag locos from the Nijmeegsche Tramweg Maatschappij (NTM), also built around the turn of the century, were added to the Maas en Waal roster.

Two of the former (M&W Nos.2 and 5) and one of the latter (NTM No.5) were built for the layout. They were not built to rivet-counter specifications: for example, the wheels of the Halling 'Varioantrieb' mechanisms we used for convenience are too small, and they do not have connecting rods, but this is hardly visible due to the skirted body.

For passenger transport we have a Pennock coach (No.7), Pennock post/goods wagon (LD No.2), and an open Falcon coach (No.4, from the NTM in 1920 like the Hanomag locos). It was originally built in the UK in 1891, but found not rigid enough by the NTM. It was modified in 1892, including closed compartments at both ends. It is interesting to note that the exceptionally long bogie centre spacing of the Falcon coaches caused problems where the track came too close to trees and buildings on tight corners. In some cases, a piece of the corner of a building was chamfered to provide the required clearance, as visible on the corner of the butcher's.

Goods wagons include vans CHG No.3, G No.2 (for milk), G No.3, and open H No.1. More rolling stock has been built, but there is only so much space on the layout.

All the coaches and wagons were scratchbuilt from styrene, and use SkipLock magnetic couplings.



Control

In order to be able to talk to people at exhibitions, the team chose to automate the layout with digital control using a Roco Multimaus and Koploper software. Not only the trams are controlled automatically, but there are also sounds such as the tram whistle and background sounds like singing birds and the occasional mooing cow.

The engines are equipped with Kühn N025 decoders.

The points are switched using Tortoise motors and a DCC decoder.

An XpressNetLi module interfaces between the Multimaus and the laptop via USB. The same module is also the interface to the S88n feedback module for occupancy detection using Hall effect sensors.

All the electronics hardware is from RoSoft, a small Dutch manufacturer.

Future

The success of *Koningswaal* renewed the team's interest in continuing the original layout, which has been reduced in size (again). Our focus is now on building the tram depot in Druten.

Koningswaal will be at the Chiltern MRA exhibition in Stevenage on 12th and 13th January.

A backwoods fantasy

his layout was built on a baseboard I had made for a future American N gauge layout that never happened. I knew it was a small space to work in but I enjoyed the challenge. I had G scale in the garden for many years, but following a switch to 5" gauge I reluctantly decided to abandon G and continue with a small On30 collection. I am a fan of all things narrow gauge and the Shay and Climax types are impressive machines both in real life and in model form. The layout really serves as an attractive backdrop to two Shays and a Climax as well as a few other locos.

It was enjoyable to make the layout and most of the structures, as nearly everything is made from coffee stirrers, Sundeala board, and junk I already had lying around. Nothing had to look exactly like anything in the real world, so there was a lot of freedom with things being built to closely resemble reality or as just plain fantasy items.

The main part of the layout was made about three years ago and a recent burst of activity has brought it to a stage where it is presentable. It is strictly home based, like all my layouts, as I have no desire to exhibit at this stage.

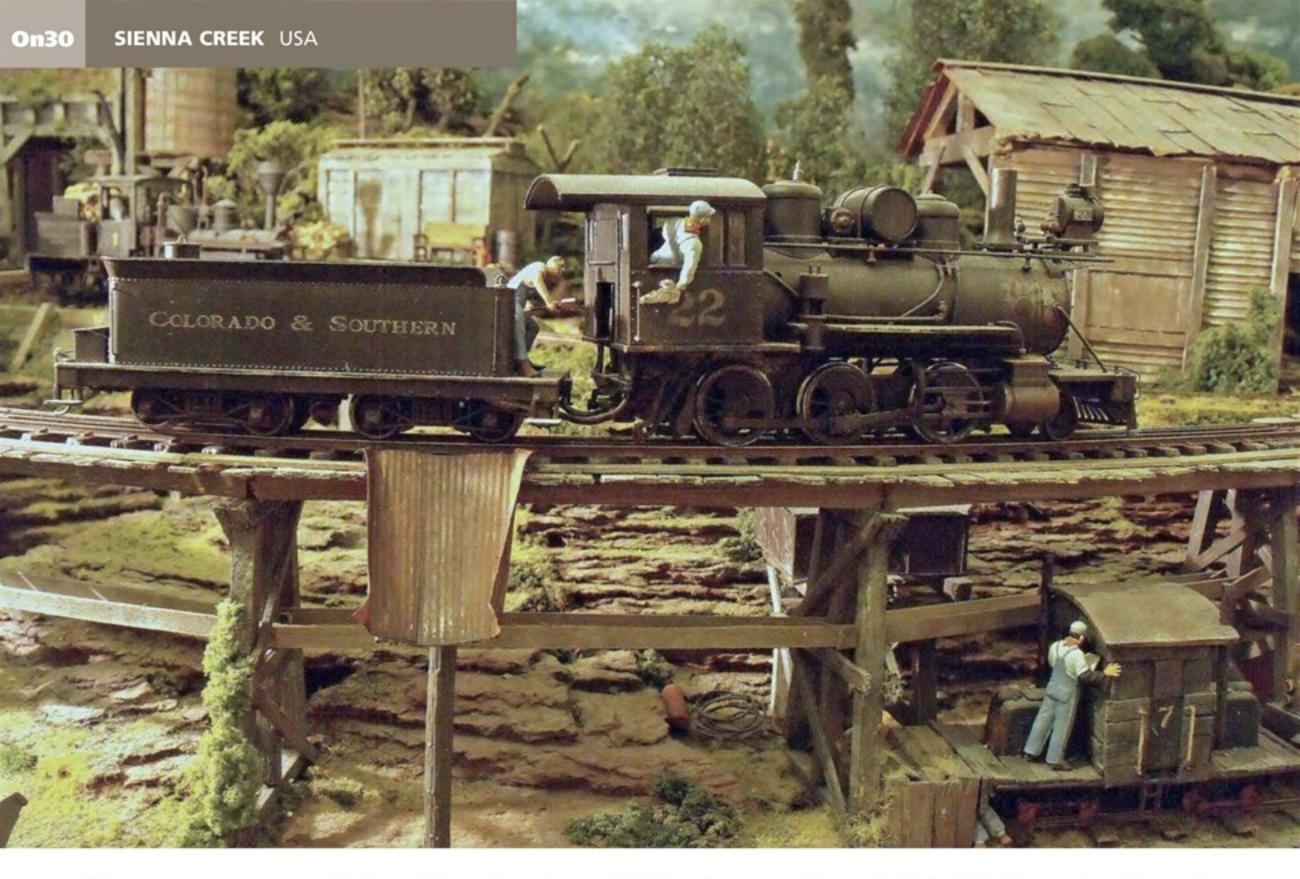
The layout manages to fit a lot into a small space, just 4'1" x 3'21/2".

The layout did not take too long to build, if you ignore the gaps of inactivity. Everything is made very roughly and without much (or any?) measuring. The layout is rough and ready, just something from my imagination helped by a few photos of bygone American industrial lines and my experience of garden railways. I am also certain that it is not completely finished yet.

Some track is Peco and some was made with old OO rail glued to coffee stirrer sleepers.

Part way through construction I bought a job lot of On30 parts which were perfect for this layout, and many of the items can be seen strewn around – after a coating of burnt sienna acrylic and black wash / weathering pastels for rust.

The crane is a Ratio OO kit. It is currently awaiting repair.

The loco shed and the other large building (which can be whatever you want it to be) have roofs made of tinfoil strips resembling corrugated iron which were purchased on line. Again these have been painted with acrylic and weathered with Tamiya weathering kits.

The water is many layers of varnish over a painted base.

The trees are a mixture of ready-made, Woodland Scenics kits, sea moss and scatter, and dead foliage from my garden covered in Busch scenic materials.

I used real dried soil from an old plantpot for ballast, and the Sundeala board was broken up for rocks as well as being used for baseboard material on top of the original chipboard

Geared articulated locos like Climax #90 and the Shays are ideally suited to the sharp curves, rough track, and light bridges. and as the basis for the upper layer. Rock faces from broken board was not my idea, but something mentioned in the Sundeala instructions – I find it very effective.

Control and operation

This is really just a glorified train set – like most of my layouts. It is operated by DCC, and most of the locos have sound. I run everything with an ancient ZTC controller which has a great feel with the metal controls but relatively few func-

tions; however, it is perfect for this set up. Peco switches control the points, which are fitted with solenoids.

A lot can be done in the way of switching stuff about on the upper lines, but I am mostly happy to watch the trains go by. Even with a layout this small (for O scale), the trains can disappear for a bit behind the scenery before re-emerging, and everything runs at snail's pace.

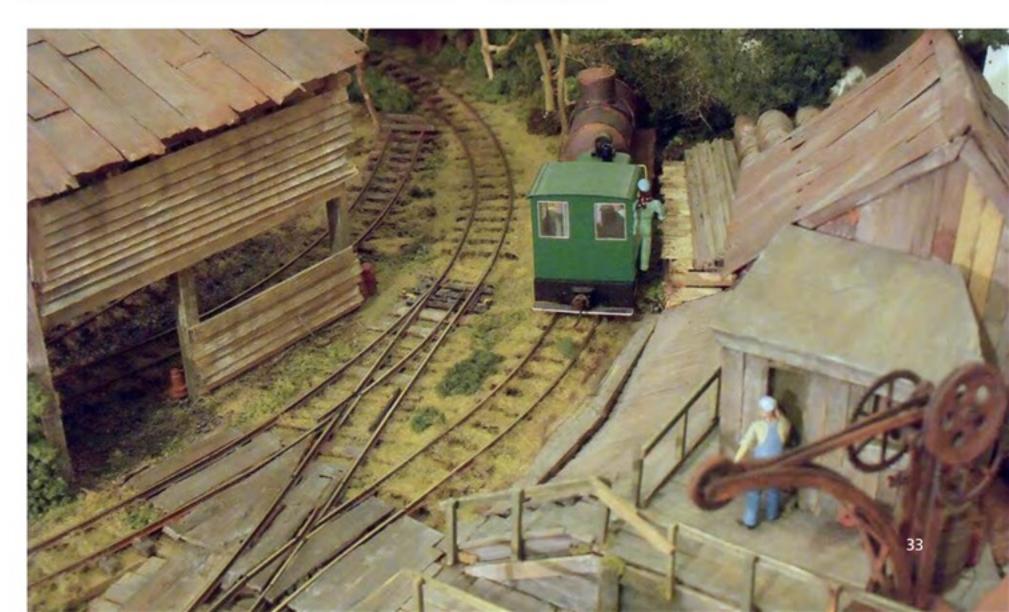
The layout runs mainly logging and mineral traffic, but anything goes.

Motive power and rolling stock

The stock is a mixture of kits, kit-bashes, scratchbuilt bodies on commercial chassis, and ready-to-run items.

Both Shays were purchased secondhand; one had already been detailed and weathered, but I gave it my own finish.

One of the Davenport locos with a kit or scratchbuilt body was also purchased on line. I have done nothing to it as the previous owner had made it look so good.

I have a couple of Porters, three four-wheel diesels, and a few other locos. I have a Backwoods kit to convert a Porter Below left

with a rear bogie in place of the pony truck, but that will need a lot of time to do properly. A Fleischmann 'Magic Train' four-wheel diesel loco is left permanently in the siding along with a converted Bachmann HO loco which blew up.

Apart from ready-to-run stock, the rest of the vehicles are my own work, including an Ixion 'Coffee Pot' railcar cut down to suit my tight curves. It is the only passenger vehicle on the layout. It has also been weathered.

More stock will be weathered in due course.

A bogie tank car was bought secondhand; it had been converted by the previous owner using an HO model as a basis.

Due to the extreme trackwork over the viaduct, I am in the process of making the log cars go round tighter curves and have converted one so far. The Shays and the Climax cope very well with tight curves, just like the real things.

Conclusion

Before anyone keen-eyed or more knowledgeable writes to complain, I do not pretend to know much about American railways and so a lot of it is probably completely fanciful. The lack of restrictions has made it a lot of fun to make and it is still fun to operate. You cannot beat modelling narrow gauge if you do not like rules!

Epiais-Rhus – Theuville

A classic metre gauge wayside station, with a nearby mill



ackground

Many of you reading this will have some difficulty in finding the commune of Epiais-Rhus on a map of France, not to mention Theuville, the other commune tagged on to the station name. Epiais-Rhus, as a commune now without a railway, still exists but it is small, just some 600 inhabitants, situated some 27 miles north of Paris in the department of Val d'Oise in an area known as the Vexin.

The metre gauge railway along the valley of the river Sausseron from Valmondois station to Marines was opened as far as Epiais-Rhus in 1886, hence the terminal station facilities. It did not reach its final destination of Marines until 1891. During the latter part of the 19th century, metre gauge railways were seen as an economic way of providing public transport to rural areas. At their peak in the 1930s

there were over 8,000 miles of secondary railways in France, the majority of which were metre gauge. The economic conditions and much increased competition from road transport after the First World War took a toll but 6,500 route miles still survived until after the Second World War. There were still 800 miles open in 1965, but the line from Valmondois to Marines was not amongst them. In 1940 De Dion NJ railcars had been introduced but, by 1948, the railway was running at a deficit. Traffic could have been increased but it would require new equipment, and road transport was cheaper. Closure by the department came in June 1949, but this was not the end of the story.

In 1976 a group of enthusiasts, the Musée des Transports de la Vallée du Sausseron (MTVS) took over the old railway depot at Valmondois with a view to setting up a museum, creating a workshop in which to restore their aged steam locomotives, and re-opening the line from Valmondois to Nesles-le-Vallée. By 1995, the museum and workshop were set up and the track was laid up the hill to the Bois

Thibault. All was going well when disaster struck. There was a change in the political complexion of the local authority and a benign, supportive environment changed to one of obstruction. The final nail in the coffin was a rock fall in the cutting in 2007, reducing the available track to 300 metres. However, this was not the end of the MTVS – but that is a different tale.

So much for the actual place. In 1994, Claude Wagner, a well known expert on French secondary railways and a leading light in the MTVS, wrote a book entitled *Les petits trains et tramways du Val d'Oise*. This includes a section headed "La gare d'Epiais-Rhus-Theuville et son moulin, un intéressant module à réaliser pour les modélistes." It contains everything needed to create a layout or diorama. There is a track plan showing the relationship between the station building, the water tower, the engine shed, and the mill. There are dimensioned drawings of the engine shed and station buildings, and a series of photos of the station, the mill, and the café. It was this that inspired Gabriel Rénie to reconstruct this area in miniature. Elsewhere in the book are drawings and photographs of the rolling stock, so what more does an experienced modeller need?

Anyone who models French metre gauge in N will have come across Gabriel either personally or by correspondence. Over the years he has produced hundreds of items of metre gauge rolling stock cast in resin. Some have been supplied painted, complete with chassis, ready to run, others have been supplied as bare mouldings.

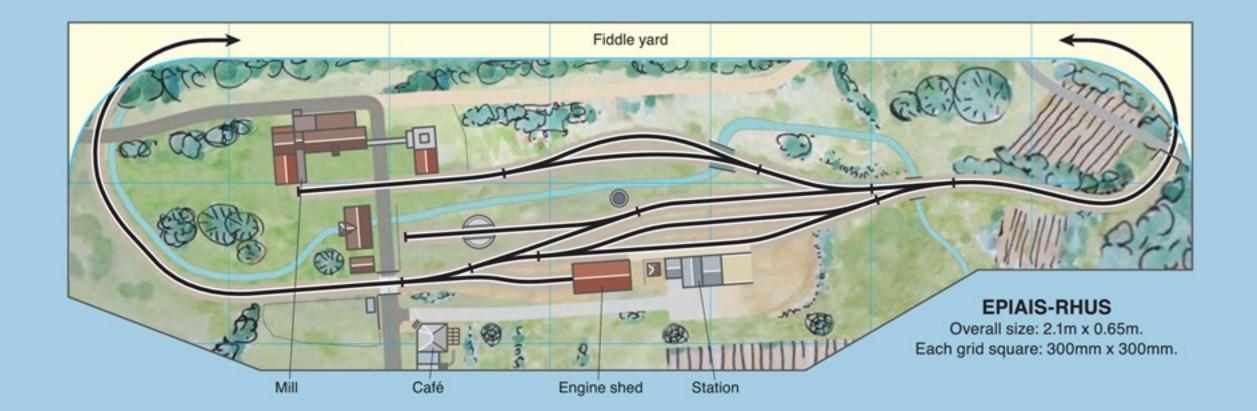
Also, since the late 1980s, the Association Français des Amis du N (AFAN) has displayed a metre gauge modular layout for publicity purposes. Four of the original modules appeared at the N Gauge Society's tenth anniversary exhibition at Harrow many years ago. Evolutions of this set-up still appear regularly at exhibitions throughout France. Gabriel has built several of these modules and is regularly seen supervising operations. However, Epiais is the first time he has tackled a free-standing layout.

As is often the case, the layout developed slowly over the years, one scratchbuilt building at a time. The crunch came in the summer of 2011 when a visiting German colleague thought it would be excellent to have at the Stuttgart exhibition later in the year. A successful trial outing was arranged at the MTVS Festival de Vapeur in October. This was most appropriate because the festival was held in the goods yard of Valmondois station where the line from Epiais terminated. As Valmondois is relatively close to Epiais, a good number of people could relate directly to the aspects of the model that still exist, such as the café, which is now a private house.

Participating in the Stuttgart show went well, and this was followed by appearances at other major exhibitions, including St.Mandé, La Mondiale, the MTVS festival again, and Rail Expo at Pontoise.

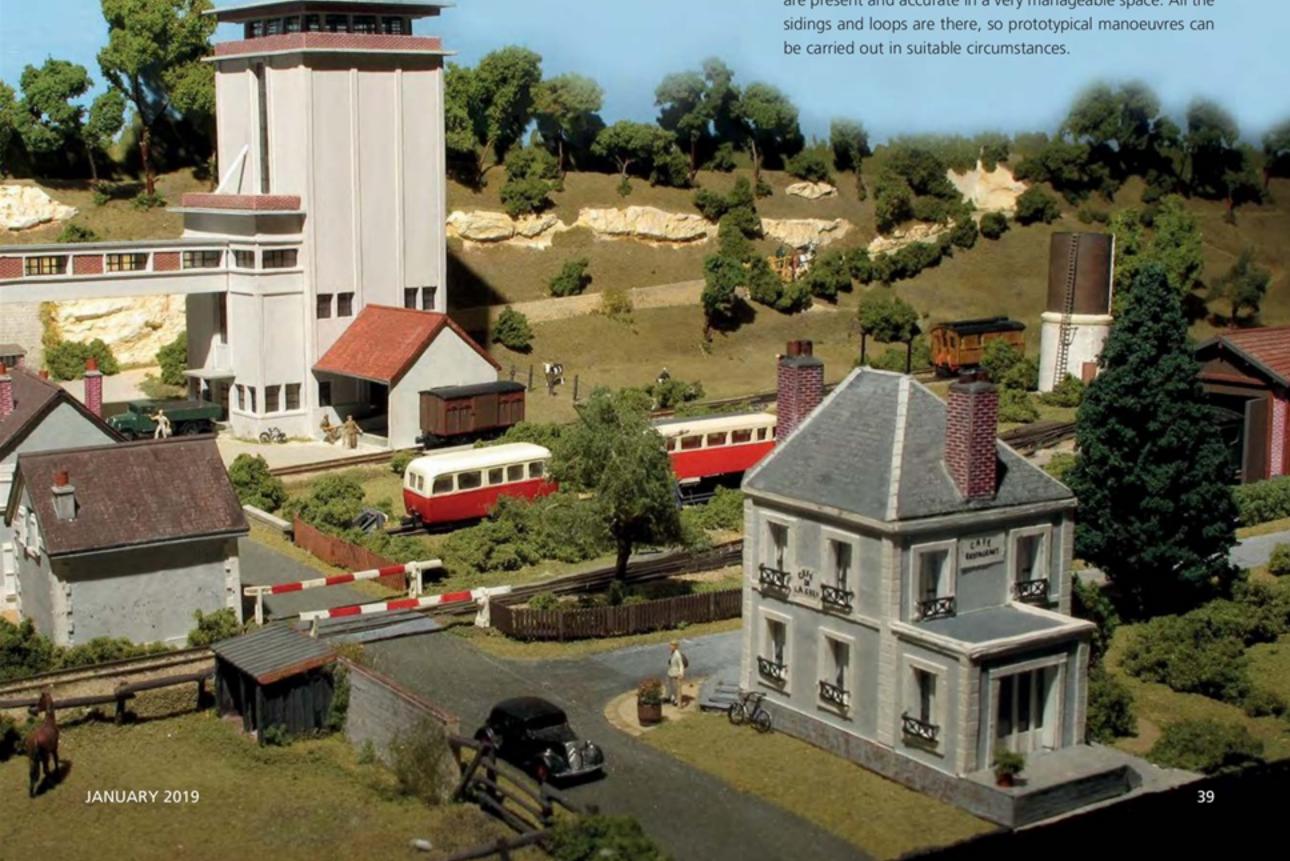
The layout

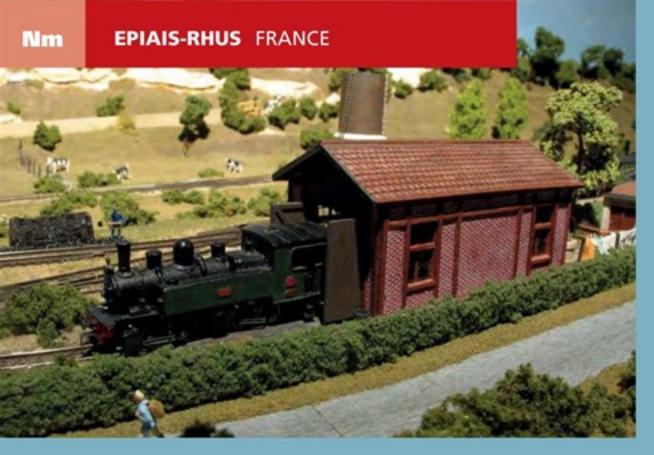
The construction of the layout follows traditional lines. It consists of a single board 2.10m x 0.65m, with L-girder construction in the central area and expanded polystyrene infill and plywood boxes at the extremities.

The track is a mixture of Märklin Mini-Club and Peco Z. A control panel operates electric points and controls current to the various track sections.

In essence the layout is a loop of track with a fiddle yard behind and the scenery in front. This is very practical in an exhibition environment. A train can be left pottering around while the operator answers the inevitable questions on scale and gauge that an Nm layout generates.

However, the object of this exercise is also to create a reasonable representation of a real place at a particular time, in this case 1948, just before closure. As usual in railway modelling, a certain amount of compression was necessary but much less in Nm than in larger scales. All the key items are present and accurate in a very manageable space. All the sidings and loops are there, so prototypical manoeuvres can be carried out in suitable circumstances.

Rolling stock

A secondary railway such as the Valmondois – Marines had a limited pool of rolling stock and it is no coincidence that Gabriel has models of every item.

The passenger services were provided primarily by De Dion NJ railcars and Gabriel is fortunate to be the owner of a pair of the Nm models produced by Mistral many years ago. For high days and holidays, there are the higher capacity steamhauled balcony-end coaches.

For freight operations there is an SACM 130T and a Mallet. The SACM is a resin moulding of a master model built by Gabriel himself in plasticard which fits onto a Märklin 2-6-0T chassis. The 020-020T Mallet is another resin moulding, this time from AFAN, running on a Märklin 0-10-0T chassis with the centre axle removed. A model of the short-

lived wooden-bodied Swedish-built Polar Deva six-wheeled locotracteur was scratchbuilt in plasticard.

Structures and details

The beauty of this layout lies in the buildings and scenery. It is very much the case of the railway wandering through the environment.

The buildings are constructed from balsa faced with paper on both sides. This technique produces a sturdy structure which is both straightforward to cut and to paint. It has the flexibility to produce the range of buildings required to model a real place.

The motor vehicles are all appropriate for the period. They are moulded in resin and painted by Gabriel.

It all comes together to make an impressive presentation.

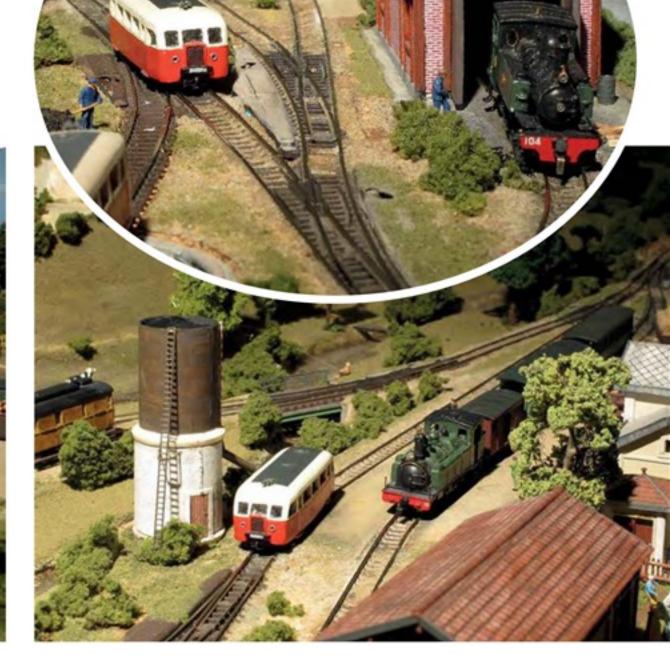

Zeltweg

A first foray into railway modelling reaches a conclusion

After studying various methods of scenery construction for the embankments and contours, I decided upon the method used by the celebrated and highly accomplished Josef Brandl – wire mesh fixed to the edge of the wooden trackbed with a heavy duty staple gun and then covered with plaster bandage (in my case ModRoc). At first I was concerned about the weight when compared with supposedly lighter methods using a latticework of cardboard strips covered with PVA-soaked paper or cotton sheets, but having

is much stronger, dries quicker, and any weight difference is negligible since it does not require any great thickness to achieve a robust structure. It also allows a certain degree of sculpting to take place while wet and any mistakes can be easily rectified. Using shaped formers or cardboard latticework requires a degree of precision in order to end up with the correct shape, whereas plaster bandage can be packed and manipulated while wet to obtain the desired contour. I think this would also work well with layers of insulation board which can be hacked to a basic shape and then covered and sculpted with ModRoc.

only because the brown finish does not need painting afterwards but because it has a more dense consistency making it ideal for building up a thick layer which is easily sculpted. It acts almost like clay and in one place I did not even need to use any scenic material to cover it. Furthermore, although it sets well, if a greater hardness and immensely strong bond is required then it can be mixed with some scenic glue to create an adhesive paste.

I had been apprehensive for some time about rock-making after seeing so many realistic representations but I finally took the plunge and purchased some Woodland Scenics moulds and casting plaster from my local model shop. I was amazed at how easy this turned out to be and any apprehensions were soon dispelled. The casting plaster was mixed with water to a cream which was then poured into the moulds which had been well lubricated beforehand with detergent water to aid final extraction. After 45 minutes they were set on a hard floor to cause any breakage. I bought just two moulds which produced a variety of nine different shapes and sizes.

The more difficult aspect was the painting to get a realistic finish but a bit of trial and error with the aforementioned Earth Colours pigments, acrylic paints, and weathering powder achieved the intended result.

The river Mur took more time and repeated efforts than any other aspect and is still not to my liking. The first attempt was too flat so I covered the painted and varnished surface with filler to create some ripples and flows but clearly I did not use enough as, after numerous coats of gloss varnish it is still looking too flat. I had not appreciated how the uneven surface would soon lose that definition under numerous layers of varnish. I felt a sense of disappointment since I have seen such great results in magazines and at exhib-





itions using traditional methods. If one contributory factor was too little filler, then my other big mistake was using an acrylic water-based varnish rather than a spirit-based yacht varnish. I thought the shorter drying time would allow me to add additional coats in a shorter period of time but despite over ten coats it still has a mediocre shine and certainly does not produce the glossy shine that you get with yacht varnish. The lesson here is surely that my impatience to save time has resulted in much more time being spent correcting the mistakes – a case of "Less haste, more speed"!

For an embankment I used a strip of polystyrene packaging together with some dense foam packaging affixed with a hot glue gun. This was then covered with tile adhesive which I read was used by some German modellers. It worked very well for me as it applies smoothly, adheres firmly, can be worked with tools during its 'open' time and then sets very hard. Any final carving can be done with sharp tools if necessary.

For speed I covered it with Gaugemaster grass mat using Solvite adhesive as, on this occasion, the paper backing needed some softening up and while I had found this a disadvantage with previous small paper items it worked perfectly for this application. I found the grass mat a little too bright, even for springtime grass, so I toned it down by dry-brushing it with some darker shades of green.

I 'planted' weed growth around some of the track areas and for this I used self-adhesive grass tufts marketed for war gaming – much faster and less messy than gluing clumps of dry static grass.

Road vehicles

I was fortunate to find a model of my grandfather's 1955 Ford Taunus 12M that I have re-painted in a similar green to his. Cars were one of the many features that made continental Europe fascinating for me as a child because both Ford and Opel produced cars from their German factories that were completely different from our Dagenham Fords or Luton Vauxhalls. Now there are global identical models that are merely badge-engineered. I am now on the hunt for a 1960s Opel Rekord that my great uncle owned.

I remember well the local lager (Gösser bier, brewed in Göss near Leoben), signs for which one would see at every Gasthaus, and so I was delighted to find a delivery lorry with trailer which is just right for the period being modelled.

The end frame that supports the cassettes was built only for that purpose but was modified when it dawned on me that it would make an ideal storage cabinet for all my locos.

Operation of the turnouts to allow trains on and off these entry/exit points is by individual route number as multiple turnouts are involved for some directions. Where only one turnout is involved, then a simple push button is used. Each route illuminates a green LED when open.

Conclusion

As I moved through this learning experience I encountered products and suppliers with whom I have been impressed. When I have referred to them, it is purely for this reason; I have no association with them other than as a satisfied customer.

This is one thing that I have learned – constantly think ahead the next few steps so that a current job does not compromise a future one.

Having got my neighbour's three-year-old son interested in my layout, it occurred to me that we should all do whatever we can to offer encouragement and practical help to
youngsters to take up this absorbing and rewarding hobby.
It will help them with their social, practical, and observational development, while for us it will help to preserve and grow
the market to keep the manufacturers investing and producing the models that we love.

Finally, my thanks to all the helpful members of the Austrian Railway Group (www.austrianrailwaygroup.co.uk), especially Stephen Ford, who always found time to answer the most obscure questions and offer help and advice during the six year build process.

Postscript

Since completing the layout, and the article, an unforeseen house move (from Devon to North Yorkshire) has forced a rethink as there is no room for *Zeltweg* in its current form.

Train cassette system

Whilst the half-hidden 'dumbbell' layout design allows continuous running, I operate prototypically and so trains enter and exit the layout via my interpretation of a traverser on the end panel of Board C. There are two entry/exit points for the Up and Down lines serving both directions.

Each train is housed within a plywood cassette. For reasons of stability and reduced cost, I used aluminium flat bar strips (from Metals4U) instead of track as wheels tend to remain more firmly engaged.

To avoid having to line up each cassette manually and then make a separate power connection, I fixed a pair of alignment guides plus fabricated copper contact strips that automatically engage with the aluminium 'track' of the cassette.

The cassettes have high sides to allow a thick protective foam cover to be placed over each consist, and so I have made a separate locomotive cassette with low sides to facilitate the insertion and removal of these delicate items.

I designed a train numbering and colour-code system for easy identification of each cassette. There are sixteen passenger and sixteen goods cassettes.

ÖBB Rh2095

A universal diesel for the 760mm gauge

n the mid-1950s the ÖBB (Austrian Federal Railways) was operating around 500km of 760mm narrow gauge lines using some sixty steam locomotives, of various classes, and around twenty diesels: most of these dated from before the Second World War and were relatively small, not powerful enough for heavy trains at line speeds. Clearly there was a need for a powerful general purpose diesel as an economical replacement for steam.

On their own initiative Simmering-Graz-Pauker proposed two designs.

The first, in 1956, was a centre cab B-B of c.340/400hp weighing 28 tons, which would have allowed them to be used on practically all the narrow gauge lines, but was considered insufficiently powerful. It would have been designated Rh2094, and although none were ordered the class number was reserved for possible future use.

The second design, type LDH 600/s, was for a full body B-B of 600hp weighing 31 tons, with a cab at each end, and a rated top speed of 60km/h. The SGP type S12a twelve-cylinder four-stroke engine had also been used in the standard gauge

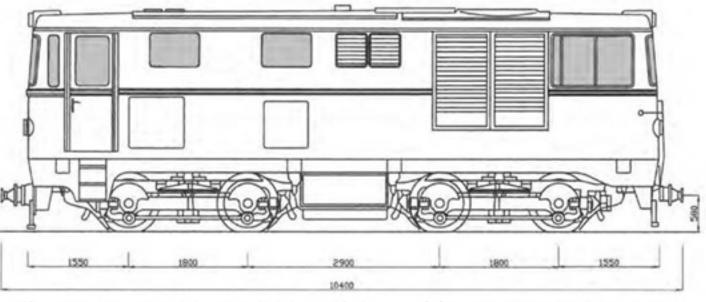

Rh2067 shunters. The drive was via a Voith two stage hydraulic transmission and cardan shafts to the outer axles on each bogie; the inner axles were coupled by the rods and flycranks. The outside framed bogies were the same as those envisaged for the smaller type. The main frame, the bogies, and the body shell were of welded steel construction. The loco had air brakes, and was equipped with vacuum brake equipment for the train.

SGP built a prototype which was delivered to the ÖBB at St.Pölten for testing on the Mariazell main line and the Gresten branch in September 1958. The loco proved successful, and is reported to have achieved 72km/h on test. On the level it could equal the Rh1099 C-C electrics for haulage capacity, and was a match for any of the existing steam loco types.

Further tests were carried out on the 35km Bregenzerwald line.

The ÖBB ordered two more locos, which were built in the Floridsdorf works and delivered in 1960. All three were allocated to the Pinzgau line after acceptance tests on the Mariazellerbahn. They were equipped with steam heating boilers for the train.

In 1961 and 1962 another twelve were supplied, but without heating boilers as independent Webasto heaters were being fitted to the coaches. This allowed the engine room to be laid out more generously. As a result the arrangement of grilles, panels, and windows was different on one side. The boilers were removed from the first three in 1968.

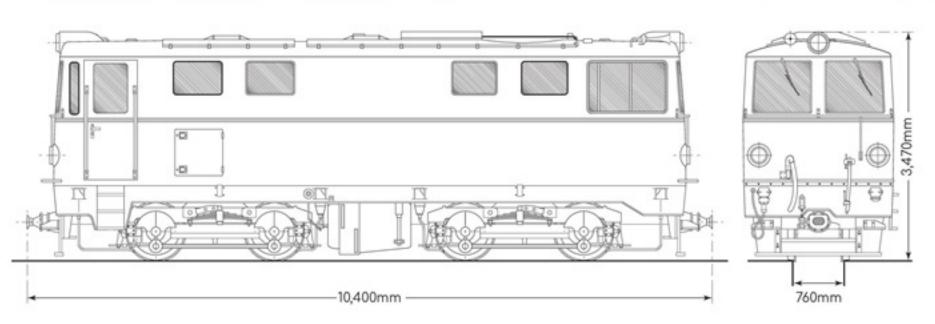

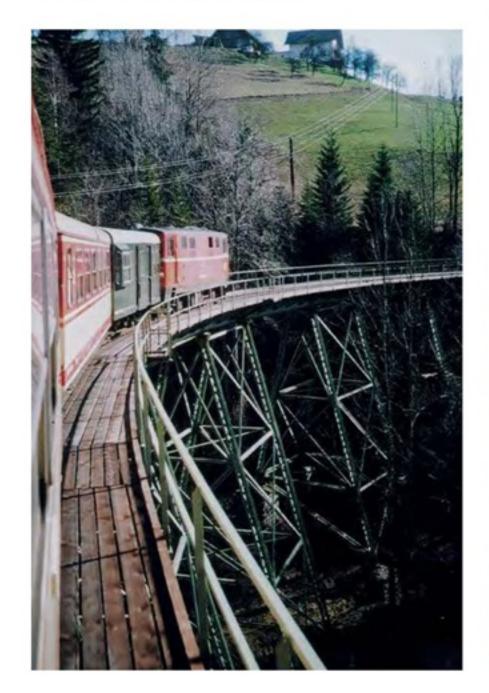




One curiosity: for at least a year the last five ran with SGP emblems on the ends, not the ÖBB insignia, as they were initially leased before purchase.

SGP hoped to sell the design to independent narrow gauge lines in Austria, and beyond: 2095 09 was tested on the Rhodopen line in Bulgaria but was thought not powerful enough. (1,100hp locos by Henschel were eventually supplied.)

One consequence of the increased weight was that the Rh2095 could not be used on all the ÖBB narrow gauge lines – a convenient cover for some closures.









They were used for all types of traffic on the Pinzgau, Bregenzerwald, Waldviertel, Ybbstal, and Gresten lines. Some of these were completely dieselised, others retained some steam. They were never used on the Steyrtal, Gurktal, and Vellachtal lines.

After the Bregenz line was closed progressively in 1980 and 1983, the locos stationed there were moved to other lines.

All fifteen were subsequently provided with wheel flange lubrication, and the cabs were soundproofed. Minor changes over the years have given each loco an individual appearance.

Due to the high centre of gravity, the class is very susceptible to overturning if the maximum permissible speed is only slightly exceeded.

Five bogie coaches and two cycle vans was described as a stiff test on the gradient to Krimml, but 01 was observed with nine coaches on test on the Mariazellerbahn.

Machines were periodically exchanged when they became due for heavy maintenance or needed repairs, which was undertaken at the St.Pölten workshops.

Thirteen of the class are still in service: 2095 02 and 03 were so heavily damaged in a head-on collision at Bramberg on the Pinzgau line on 2nd July 2005 that they were withdrawn and scrapped.

Three (01, 04, and 06) were sold to the Salzburger Lokalbahn (SLB) as part of their take-over of the Pinzgau line on 30th June 2008, becoming Vs71, Vs72, and Vs73. They are used for freight, maintenance, and nostalgic trains.

All those remaining on the ÖBB roster were handed over to the Niederösterreichische Verkehrsorganisationsgesellschaft (NÖVOG) in 2010; some were later sold on. 2095 08 also went to the Pinzgauer Lokalbahn, becoming Vs74, and 2095 13 was handed over to the Bregenzerwald museum railway in 2015. 2095 11 and 2095 14 were transported to CFI Brad in Romania on 8th July 2015.

Liveries

The locos were delivered in red & ivory with metal trim, including the cast winged wheel on each end. The first machine and the last five initially carried 'SGP' plates on the ends rather than the ÖBB emblem; this has been restored to 01 and the current Waldviertel locos V5 and V12.

The metal trim remained in place on some locos, in the all red livery, up to 1980. The trim was replaced by a thin cream line at the waist stripe and the 'flying snail' logo applied 1975 – 1986

'Computer' numbers with a check digit were applied from 1985.

From about 1988 the main body became orange-red, with a broad cream lower band, to match the so-called 'jaffa' coach livery.

In the 1990s, they progressively got the new ÖBB red/light grey/slate grey livery, still with the 'snail' logo. At least one was later decorated with the new ÖBB lettering logo.

2095.01 was restored to original livery under ÖBB auspices in 2000.

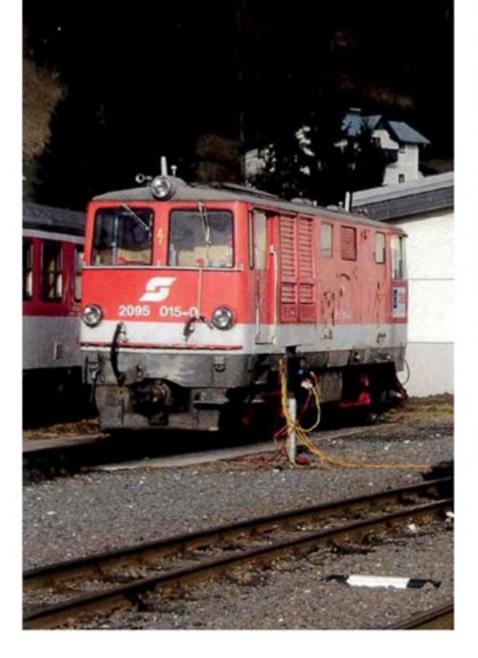
Even before the line was 'privatised', 002 became all red with Pinzgau-Bahn transfers (February 2005).

The SLB Pinzgau machines are now ruby red with a narrow white waist stripe and a curved V on the ends. Vs71 (01) remains red & cream, while Vs74 is still in the ÖBB 1980s orange & cream. All have been named after local communities.

NÖVOG have replaced the metal trim on V5 (in red & cream) and V12 (all red).

Naturally there have been variations between individual locomotives over time.

East German V200 diesel new from Piko





iors can be switched separately under digital control, likewise the main beam. Jumper switches on the printed circuit board set the lighting options for analogue operation.

The most recent arrival from Piko is a new Expert series model of the Deutsche Reichsbahn V200 2,000hp Co-Co diesel-electric, nicknamed 'Taigatrommel' due to its Russian origin and the drumming sound of the originally unsilenced exhaust. It was based on a standard Soviet design (M62) and similar machines could be found in several eastern bloc countries. Introduced in 1966, deliveries continued until 1974/5; in all 378 were supplied. Intended for freight, they had a top speed of 100km/h and no train heating.

There were experiments with silencers as early as 1969; from 108 they were fitted as standard, and from 178 a new Russian type was installed from new.

They proved powerful, robust, and versatile, and were well-liked even though the two-stroke engine and electric transmission was not so usual on the DR.

Reclassified 120 under computer numbering and 220 after reunification, the last were not finally withdrawn until 1994.

The number built, the scope of use, the length of life, and the range of possible liveries clearly make this an attractive prospect for a model manufacturer,

Piko have chosen to release the first version as V 200 026, an early unit, in Epoch III DR bordeaux red with narrow waist lining, based at Reichenbach in the Dresden administrative area. The main colour is dense and even, the lining well defined, and all markings very clearly printed, right down to the small data on the solebar and cab sides. Door handles, handrails, and kick plates are picked out in silver.

The chrome end trim is notable.

The model is very accurate according to published dimensions.

The moulded plastic body shell captures the look of the original, with ribs and grilles well represented, correctly different each side. Added parts include horns, roof vents, exhausts, and end decks (with neat tread texture), plus buffers.

The radiator fan is visible under the added etched metal grille.

The glazing is flush, with neat frames in black. The windscreen wipers are moulded in place and neatly picked out in silver. Cab and equipment room interiors are represented, the latter in some detail.

Supplied for display are full brake hoses, dummy scale couplings, and electrical connectors.

The underframe is comprehensively detailed.

The bogie side frames are accurate in detail and moulded in very deep relief, with brake cylinders, axleboxes, springs, equalising beams, textured cab steps, sandpipes, and speedometer drive; the brake shoes are separate components, in line with the wheel treads.

The model has a heavy metal chassis and is powered by a can-type five-pole motor with twin flywheels driving via cardan shafts to worms and reduction gearing to the two outer axles of each bogie. The unpowered centre axles are allowed some side play. Current collection is by wipers on the backs of all wheels. It runs smoothly and quietly, and is controllable across the speed range: on DC it will move off at c.3km/h on 1.5v, and achieves 135km/h on full power. The scale top speed of 100km/h comes at c.9.5v.

Two traction tyres are fitted (to one of the inner wheels each side) and with a weight of c.565gr pulling power should not be a problem.

LEDs provide directional white head and red tail lights, illuminating at c.3.5v, and the cab and equipment room interThe p.c.b. has a Plux22 socket for a digital decoder, and connections for a loudspeaker, with a mount behind the radiator grilles. (Piko offer a suitable sound decoder and speaker, ref.56425, which reproduces the distinctive noise of the engine.)

At each end there are standard couplings in NEM pockets flexibly mounted on the frame.

The model is delivered in the new tray & sleeve style card box, with the illustrated instruction booklet in a drawer in the base. Within the box, the customary shaped clear plastic cocoon and sleeve protects the model.

Austrian Rh2095 narrow gauge diesel new from Roco

Roco have recently released a brand new model of the Austrian class 2095 760mm gauge B-B diesel-hydraulic.

The background to this 600hp mixed traffic narrow gauge locomotive is described elsewhere in this issue. Suffice it to say that the new model is an appropriate way to mark the sixtieth anniversary of the introduction of the type, and given the number built, the long career, relatively widespread use in Austria, and a variety of liveries it is a very sensible choice for a model manufacturer.

The new model represents the series production machines (numbers 4 to 15), and is very accurate according to published dimensions, drawings, and photographs. Doors, panels, handles, grilles, and louvres are faithfully reproduced.

Added parts include the nose and door handrails, windscreen wipers, horns, fan grille (metal mesh) and protective bars.

One interesting detail - the main exhaust on the roof is slightly off-centre, the first time this has been correctly done; all previous models (Liliput, Stängl, and Ferro Train in HOe, and even LGB) had it on the centre line. It is hard to believe that all the former constructors did not have access to accurate plans and dimensions, or could not have inspected one of the real things; perhaps it was simply thought to look better in the middle even if not strictly correct.

The model represents 2095.04 in the original orange-red and cream, with metal waist beading.

Also announced is 2095 010-1 in the later slate grey & red livery, with the metal beading removed (which presumably requires a separate body tool).







The finish is first class, with dense main colours, precise separation, and very neatly printed markings. Etched plates are also supplied for the modeller to apply over the printed markings if required - numbers, ÖBB emblems, and makers' plates. The plates are ready painted but need to be polished (as shown) to expose the raised lettering before application.

The glazing fits flush, with black or metallic frames as appropriate.

The cabs have interiors, complete with fire extinguishers, and a driver figure in the No.1 end. Note too the detailed rims to the headlights.

Optional parts include snowploughs (full or cut-away for working couplings), short coupling link bars, imitation scale size coupler heads, dummy screw links, and alternative red electrical cables.

Black brake hoses and grey electrical connectors are already in place.

The underframe carries the battery box on one side and fuel tank, with level indicator, on the other; adjacent to them are the sandboxes, with delivery pipes also behind the buffer beams.

The bogie side frames feature suspension components and brake gear, fine metal coupling rods, and detailed fly cranks, of scale thickness. The underside

Current collection is by wipers on all wheels.

The loco runs smoothly and quietly even straight from the box, though 30 minutes running-in is recommended, in each direction at moderate speed. The model is controllable from walking pace to a realistic maximum.

With a weight of 165gr, hauling capacity should be ample.

The minimum recommended radius is 261mm.

The model has a NEM 658 Plux22 socket for a digital decoder, and is also offered with DCC sound installed. (We understand these are in short supply.)

It has working directionally controlled head and tail lights; DIP switches on the internal printed circuit board isolate the tail lights either end, or cancel all lights. The model comes fitted with the usual narrow gauge hook & loop couplers

attractive price. No doubt we will see more liveries and numbers as new items in future.



of the bogies even has a representation of the final drive gearbox covers.

As to the model mechanism, a cast metal chassis block carries a five-pole open frame skew-wound motor with flywheel driving through brass worms to reduction gearing in the bogies. All axles are driven by gear train; the rods and cranks are cosmetic.

There are two traction tyres, on one wheel of each inner axle. Replacing traction tyres involves removing the cranks and rods; the cranks are keyed to ensure correct quartering.

Polish type 406R bogie tank wagon new from Piko



New in the Expert range from Piko is a model of a modern type Zaes bogie tank wagon, used in Poland as type 406R.

These were designed by the Swidnica wagon factory in 1963. Series production began a year later, and continued until 1981, with over 10,000 built. The wagon was made in two basic variants: as type 406Ra with heating and type 406Rb without. The vehicles were predominantly designed for oil products, but some food companies also use them for molasses.

The tank is held to the frame with four adjustable tension straps.

Filling can be from above or below, through the bottom valve. Unloading is through the bottom or side drain valves, partially with the help of a suitable pump. These wagons are allowed a maximum speed of 100km/h. Some have been partially rebuilt during their service.

Our sample carries Epoch V PKP markings, all very neatly printed down to the smallest data on the panels, with the running number 33 51 798 4 654-8. It is decorated for the Orlen company based in Plock.

The plastic body is appropriately plain, with just the few horizontal ribs moulded in place; it is augmented with many separately added parts, such as etched metal top walkways and access ladders, top filler and vents, securing straps (with turnbuckles), and end access hatch and drain pipes.

On the underframe, the shunters' steps, brake handwheels, and buffer

heads are added components, while the discharge pipes, brake cylinder, air reservoir, and rodding and pipework are separate mouldings, and the brake controls and lashing hooks are neatly picked out on the side frame. The end platform, railings, and steps are formed in resilient plastic, with an impressive deck, part chequer plate and part open mesh.

Brake hoses and dummy scale couplings, very finely moulded in black plastic, are supplied for the modeller to fit.

The bogie side frames are well formed, with axleboxes and leaf springs represented; the brake rigging is added, with brake shoes in line with the wheel treads.





The model runs freely on blackened metal disc wheels on pinpoint metal axles, insulated one side by a plastic centre bush.

Standard couplings are fitted in NEM pockets on close-coupling mounts.

New from LS Models are two sets of three Pullman first class coaches for the Côte d'Azur train, in the 1934 blue & cream livery with the large cast monogram in the centre of each side. (Just to confuse the unwary, the label on the end of the box shows them as all blue!)

Each set consists of one type WPc Pullman coach with kitchen and two type WP without; ref.79170 features numbers WPc 4143, with WP 4150 and 4162; ref.79473 is similar but with different running numbers.

In each case the livery is very well reproduced, with dense colours (a matt blue, and a slight satin sheen to the cream), clear separation, and neatly printed markings.

The moulded bodyside beading is not too prominent, while the rivets, panels, and vents on the roof, different according to type, are most impressive.

The doors are enhanced with separate metal handrails.

The glazing is slightly inset, as per prototype, and some windows have blinds partially lowered. The vehicles boast full interior detail – partitions, armchairs with white headrests, and brass lamps on the tables.

Alternative parts are supplied for display (or on the open end of a train) – corridor connections and support arms.

The bogie frames have outside equalising beams, plain bearing axleboxes, and projecting transverse spring planks.

SBB Re4/4^{II} electric new from Hobbytrain



Recently released under the brand name of Hobbytrain, European models made for Lemke, in this case in South Korea, is a new model of the Swiss Re4/4^{||} first series, in the later red livery, with Epoch III/IV markings. The finish is good, with all markings neatly printed.

These machines were designed as universal locomotives for the SBB and are used both for passenger and freight trains. 277 built between 1964 and 1985 make it the largest class in Switzerland, still in use today. The Re4/4^{||} could take curves at speed without damaging the track; top speed was 140km/h, with a power rating of 4,700kW.

Some were rebuilt specifically for the Swiss Express service, with an extended buffer beam, new couplings, and a special orange & grey livery, with the SBB logo instead of the Swiss cross.

These locomotives are also used by the BLS and other Swiss railways.

The model is accurate according to published dimensions, and well detailed, with insulators and cabling on the roof, access walkways and seemingly seethrough grilles. Nose and cab door handrails and cab door handles are moulded in place and neatly picked out in silver.

The glazing fits flush, with the windscreen wipers printed on and cab door windows mirrored; the cabs have basic interiors.

The bogie side frames are moulded with very good relief detail, with spoked wheels.

The mechanism is built around a split frame cast metal chassis, carrying a central five-pole motor with twin flywheels which drives all axles via worms and reduction gears on the bogies. Current is collected via axle bearings on all wheels; there is no provision for using the pantograph.







Operation is smooth and quiet, with good control across the speed range. Running in of half-an-hour in each direction at three-quarter power is recommended. Two traction tyres are fitted, one on each outer axle. With a weight of 60gr, tractive effort should be adequate.

The printed circuit board within has a NEM 651 socket for a digital decoder. Dismantling and installation instructions (in German and English) are included.

There are working directionally-controlled LED white head and red tail lights. In analogue mode, these can be isolated (for use in multiple consists or with a driving trailer) but this has to be done by removing the body and physically moving the LED boards in the sockets.

Standard couplers are fitted on pogies.

Original green and Swiss Express livery versions are also available.

The underframe is well detailed with a planked floor, perforated main fishbelly girders, battery boxes, and brake gear, with the generator articulated to the



adjacent bogie so it does not impede rotation. There are slight differences in the fittings between the types.

The models run freely on blackened metal disc wheels on pinpoint metal axles, insulated one side with a plastic centre bush. Standard couplers are fitted in pockets on close-coupling mounts on the frame.

The minimum radius recommended is c.225mm.

The set comes in an elegant foamlined presentation box, and each coach is held in its slot wrapped in a dark blue silk cloth emblazoned with the CIWL coat of arms – a nice touch of class. Very stylish models.

Feldbahn light railway rolling stock new from Roco





Roco have recently released several new models representing narrow gauge Feldbahn rolling stock.

These have been achieved by cleverly combining the bodies of the existing four-wheel vehicles from Rügen with bogies made from the standard channel frame skip chassis. Where the single axles would have been, a simple bolster has been fitted, with a pivot which mounts the bogie, a simple clip fit.

The bodies are narrow and eminently suited to this freelance adaptation.

The simple coach has sides clad in sheet metal (as opposed to vertical wooden planking), and is painted green with wooden window frames. It has flush glazing and interior fittings, including a stove, with a corresponding smoke stack on the roof, along with vents.

The end platforms have steps, railings, grab handles, and ornate supports for the roof.

The Rügen original four-wheeler was built by Görlitz in 1895, seated 18, and was 7.1m long and 2.05m wide.

The coach is also offered with Deutsche Reichsbahn Epoch III markings as a type Bp4 numbered 970-202, with neatly printed markings. In this case the window frames are metallic.



Also available is a *Materialwagen* or stores van, in grey with black ironwork. It is derived from the variant without a brake platform. Steps under the doors and tiny lamp brackets for one end are supplied for the modeller to fit if required; these latter are perhaps less appropriate in a Feldbahn context.



The roof clips in, and there is a metal weight embedded in the floor.

The original four-wheeler was built by Görlitz in 1895/6 to carry 7.5t; it was 5.5m long and 1.8m wide.

Plain versions of the van and an open wagon have also been announced.

All have wheels with metal tyres and plastic centres on pinpoint metal axles. Wire coupling loops are mounted on the bogie frame.

Sparmax Zeta compressor for airbrushes

Airbrush specialist Sparmax has released a new compressor, with the firm's new (and unique) Smart-Stop feature, which allows users to pause it remotely by means of an airbrush hold-



er which acts on a switch in the base of the regulator/pressure gauge which can be clamped to the workbench, away from the compressor. This means that the life of the compressor can be extended by automatically shutting off when the brush is placed in the holder (also saving energy) and re-started when the brush is taken out of the holder.

It is 240mm long, 140mm wide, and 215mm tall, and weighs 4.6kg. It is supplied with 2m of braided cable to connect the regulator to the airbrush (not included but shown in our photos as a 'serving suggestion'), a coiled air line to join the compressor to the regulator, and a cable (approximately 5' in length) which serves as the link between the on/off switch and the compressor. It is this length of cable that determines how far away the compressor can be from the work surface.

The Zeta works at a maximum pressure of 60psi and is rated for 40 minutes continuous use, but then it should be left for a quarter of an hour or so to cool, after which it can be re-started.

Many low air-consumption airbrushes suitable for use with the Zeta compressor, such as the Sparmax MAX-4 seen here, can be found on the relevant page of the Airbrush Company's website.

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South African ex Queensland locos from Chartwell and CMD



Chartwell Models in the UK and CMD Models of South Africa have collaborated with Southern Rail Models in Queensland to produce extra versions of the new 1:87 scale models of the Queensland Clyde-built GM-powered locos to represent the units sold in 2013/4 for further use in South Africa.

Two were sold to African Rail & Traction Services while a third went to RRL Grindrod Locomotives. Thirteen 2170 class were purchased by Transnet to become class 35.800 but only eleven were reliveried (using vinyls) and put into working order; two were renumbered but only used as a source of spares.





There are differences between the two types which form the class; this meant that one of the first choice locos could not be modelled without additional tooling so 35.804 and 35.810 were selected.

Grindrod BG15-03 was QR 2412D. There are a couple of differences between the real thing and model but the expense of extra tooling could not be justified for a limited run.

The finish is excellent, with good coverage of the main colours, sharply defined edges, crisp lining, and neatly printed markings.

The moulded plastic body is very well detailed, with panels and grilles as per prototype, enhanced with many added detail parts such as etched fans and radiator grilles, along with lift rings, horns, grab handles, handrails, and handbrake wheel. Brake hoses, coupler cut bars, and electrical connectors have been added to the pilot beams, and

the underframe also has added the air reservoirs, pipework, step treads, and step lights. The bogie sideframes benefit from added brake cylinders, pipework, sandboxes, and delivery pipes. The cab is flush glazed, with interior fittings and crew figures, windscreen wipers, and rear-view mirrors. Note that many of these fine features are quite delicate, so take care when handling.

The mechanical design follows the proven formula – a metal chassis block carries a central five-pole skew-wound motor with brass flywheel, driving via universal joints and cardan shafts and reduction gearing in the bogies. All blackened metal wheels are driven and collect current. There is working directional LED lighting, plus marker and ditch lights, and a twenty-one pin socket for a digital decoder.

The weight should ensure ample pulling power without traction tyres. The wheels have fine flanges.



Working genuine Kadee knuckle couplers are mounted on the frame.

The models are available in both 12mm and 16.5mm gauges, for analogue DC or DCC with sound (using ESU LokSound V4 decoders).

background sound modules by AVT Products

AVT Products offer an innovative selection of devices to equip a layout with background sounds.

Series 100 mp3 sound module

This package includes the sound module, a 60mm diameter loudspeaker enclosure (on a c.1m lead), a mini-USB to USB lead (c.1m), a momentary push-button panel mounting switch, and a mains power supply (according to country of use). The user only needs to provide the wires to the switch – and the sound, of course!

The device has a digital memory capacity of 4MB which is enough for a sound file lasting about four minutes.

Suitable sound files can be sourced from the internet.

AVT Products website has a list of links to sites from which sound files can be downloaded free.

There is also advice on modifying the sound files – for example, shortening the sound if the file is too large, linking two files, or introducing a pause.

You can also load your own sound files.

To load sounds, the device simply connects to your computer (PC or Mac) via the USB lead. The computer 'sees' the device as an external drive, and the file can be simply copied to it.



The computer provides power to the device via the USB lead; a bright green LED confirms power is present.

To play the sound, the USB lead is used to power the device from the mains power supply.

The speaker is connected via a 3.5mm stereo jack plug and socket, on c.1m of lead.

Playback is activated by a momentary push-button switch; the mounting hole is 7.5mm diameter. Cables must be soldered to the switch, but attach easily to the device with miniature screw terminals.

The volume can be adjusted using small buttons on the device; the device then remembers the set volume. A small slide switch selects single or continuous play.

As an alternative to the push-button, you can use a reed switch or a relay contact.

Further, as an alternative to any mechanical method, or in parallel with it, the device includes an opto-isolator input for a signal from an electronic control system – a switched output from a digital system accessory decoder should be suitable.

The module features a high quality printed circuit board held within an ingenious clip-together plastic casing, which occupies an area of 60mm x 52mm, and is 21mm high; it has two 3mm diameter mounting holes.

There is no means of attaching the speaker enclosure to the layout, but a double-sided sticky pad should suffice.

The sound quality will naturally depend on the original, but examples we have heard sounded quite convincing even in isolation (i.e. under demonstration and test conditions as opposed to installed on a layout.)

The whole package seems well thought out, well made, and easy to use.

A three channel version (with 8MB memory) is also available; sounds can be played separately or simultaneously.



The website has instructions and advice in several languages, including English, French, German, and Dutch.

French railcar trailer kits from Draisine 160



Draisine 160 has recently produced two kits for French autorail trailers (remorques) which use 3D-printed bodies with other components.

The XR6000 trailer was typically hauled by the X2800 and X2100/2200 autorails. Built to a modern design, they seated 76. They were largely withdrawn in the mid-2000s, but a few examples survived into the modern dark blue & grey rebranding of the TER fleet.

The body is printed in 1mm thick plastic; two finishes available, with the higher detail print costing a little more. The chassis features seats.

The model runs on Piko bogies with Atlas wheels of the correct size which reduce the ride height.

The kit includes parts to allow couplers to be installed on the bogies.

Price for the full kit ranges from £80.00 to £92.00 (+ P&P) depending on the quality of the body shell print.

The sample shown was painted by Jon Cassidy.

The XR7300/7800 trailers were in service until the late 1980s, with a small number surviving until the mid-1990s.



They were typically hauled by a variety of autorails, including the X3800 Picasso, the X2400, and even the X2200.

There are two similar types available. Illustrated is the XR7300.

The model runs on Bandai bogies which are available from Japan. These bogies can swivel within the tight constraints of the body; this avoids the need for the cut-away evident on other models of this type.

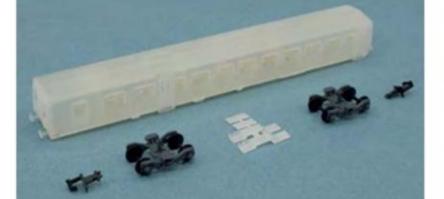
The chassis designs feature different seating for the different types – the XR7300 is different at either end.

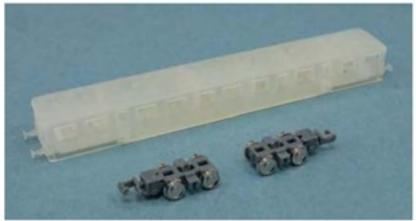

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Deutsche Bundesbahn BR103 electric new from Piko

Piko have recently released a new model of the Deutsche Bundesbahn BR103 Co-Co electric which was announced at Nürnberg in February: it has arrived rather late for the garden railway season!

The E03 was introduced with four prototypes in 1965, and soon became the symbol of the Bundesbahn by heading premium passenger services – fast, efficient, reliable, and stylish. Production between 1970 and 1974 saw 145 enter service, with a power rating of 7,440kW.

The first locomotives were supplied with scissors pantographs; after 1976 the single-arm SBS65 was used.

The front skirts and the buffer cladding were also removed.

Withdrawals began in 1997, but the last did not go until 2003. Several are preserved.

Disregarding the question of the scale of standard gauge machines on nominal metre gauge track (approximately 1:27, in relation to the length), the 721mm long shortened model captures the stylish appearance of the class.

The model represents the short cab variant, with scissors pantographs.

The finish is good, with well defined colours and clear markings, for Epoch IV. The model represents 103 134-3.

103134-3





The moulded plastic body shell has good representations of the panels, grilles, and louvres, and is enhanced with some separately-applied parts, such as the windscreen wipers and lower door handrails.

The nose grab handles are provided for the modeller to fit, along with a cut-away skirt if a working coupler is required at both ends.

The cab door handrails are moulded in place.

The cab has interior detail, with a driver figure at one end, and the machine room interior is also represented.

The roof is well detailed, with insulators, cabling, and switchgear represented. There are slits in the roof to allow the pantographs to be raised and lowered remotely, though exactly how is left to the modeller's ingenuity. The pantographs are metal, and sprung, but not wired for current collection.

The cladding around the buffers can be removed if required.

The bogie sideframes are particularly impressive, moulded in deep relief.

The head and tail lights are LEDs, directionally controlled. The model is also ready to have lights in the cabs and engine room (optional accessory ref.36017, four required, each €12.00), which can be separately switched under digital control.

The model has connections for a digital decoder (ref.36122, €100.00), which can be augmented with a sound unit with authentic sounds (ref.36229, €146.00); the loudspeaker is mounted

between the bogies, so there is no need to remove the body.

The model runs on 24 volts, and has two powerful seven-pole motors (which need a controller of at least 2 amps with a fast-acting fuse) linked by gears to the outer and centre axles of each bogie, running in roller bearings. It will negotiate a minimum radius of 600mm. Operation on sharper curves will result in greatly increased wear of the loco wheels and the rails.

The mechanism is protected from moisture so the model is suitable for use outdoors.

The wheels have bright tyres for optimum contact, and there are pick-up wipers on all wheels. Two extra sprung track contact pick-up shoes are fitted to each bogie.

There are traction tyres on both centre wheels of each bogie, and with a weight of 4.2kg hauling capacity should be good. The massive model runs well straight from the box, but 30 minutes operation in each direction is recommended as running in.

The model has side buffers and drawgear for standard gauge, and comes fitted a working LGB-compatible coupling at one end, with another supplied to install on the other if needed.

Instructions in four languages (German, English, French, and Dutch), illustrated with 'exploded' drawings, are provided.

A good level of detail combined with robust construction should make this another popular loco with large scale modellers.

Loco-Revue – Hors Serie 64 Voies réelles et voies modèles

This new special from the leading French model railway magazine Loco-Revue, dated 12/2018, is concerned with track, prototype and model, with the aim of assisting to make the best choice for your layout, whatever the scale or gauge. Without track for the trains to run on, there is no railway!

It has been some time since there was a comprehensive survey of what is currently available commercially (in and for France), even though the choice is crucial and must be made early in every layout project.

This book aims to compare the products in terms of geometry, ease of use, quality of construction, level of detail, and cost.

The context is provided by extensive consideration of the prototype – from different types of rail (there was some early use of bullhead in France before flat bottom dominated) through track components and accessories (such as wagon turntables and traversers, and buffer stops) to crossovers and crossings. Further topics include the control of points (point levers, signal boxes, point rodding and cables); trackbed profiles (cuttings and embankments, with drainage, etc.); sleeper spacings, and how they vary, with only a very brief mention of bi-bloc concrete sleepers; super-elevation and transition curves; the loading gauge and the 'four foot' between the tracks, and the implications of this for long stock on sharper than prototype curves, especially double track.

The prototype coverage is thoroughly illustrated, mostly with photos of the real thing but with some of high quality layouts or dioramas, and augmented with drawings and diagrams, and modellers should find all this of assistance in replicating realistic situations.

The model section begins by stressing the importance of standards for wheels and track with regard to reliable operation, noting that few modellers appreciate the significance. The result can be problems if you try to run older models on new track, and vice versa. The differences between NEM and NMRA standards are also noted. The importance of laying track level is mentioned, along with the benefits of equalised chassis on four-wheeled rigid frame vehicles.

The main part of the work is a survey of commercial offerings in the common scales – HO, N, O, plus tramway and industrial (inset) tracks. Narrow and metre gauges are included. There are many photos of model track components, often showing specific features in detail. Tracks with an integral ballast base are included. Joiners are not forgotten, from the simple to the elaborate.

We are pleased to note that Peco products feature prominently, usually with a recommendation.

The author also suggests it is not a good idea to buy used track secondhand.

Note that the work is essentially a product survey and not a practical guide to tracklaying, wiring, or point control.

As usual, the style of presentation is clear, attractive, and straightforward. The chapter headings use different fonts, with section headings in colour, and there are occasional tips are on coloured circles and summary information in tinted side panels.

The photos are sharp and properly exposed, the majority in colour, and all well reproduced on good quality glossy paper, most at a sensible size.

Bound into the centre of the book is a sixteen page plain paper pull-out with tables listing the ranges of all the major brands, from Busch HOf to Lenz O. (There



is no consideration of Gauge 1, or G, as this is apparently not common in France.) The pull-out also has a table comparing the dimensions of the rail, and certain aspects of the geometry, of the different brands.

The work concludes with a glossary of the technical terms used.

Some facility in French will be required to get the full benefit of the text; but by working backwards your knowledge of French terms for track components will be greatly enhanced!

The book is rounded off with just two pages of advertisements.

Carl Bellingrodt, the legendary German railway photographer of the 20th century, photographed not only steam locomotives and electric traction but also diesel motive power. Now for the first time, Eisenbahn Kurier presents a volume of 160 of his pictures of diesel locomotives, multiple units, and railcars. All are in black & white, and all are of the highest quality. They range from close-up portrait views to photographs taken from the lineside – many around the photographer's home town of Wuppertal – and aboard some diesel railcars. The period covered is essentially the early 1950s through to 1967, with a few taken back in the mid-1930s.

Following an introduction by Norman Kampmann and the EK editorial team, twenty-one pages provide a look at the different classes of diesel shunters, ranging from the ex-Wehrmacht (German Army) V20s to the Deutsche Bundesbahn's own V60 and V65 classes.

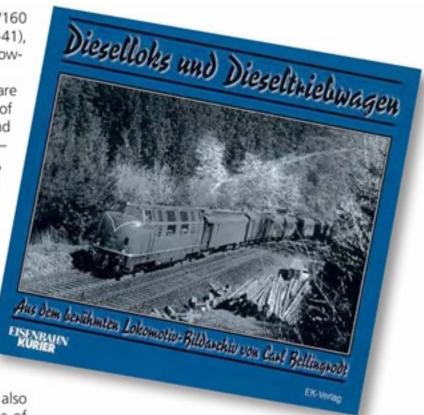
The centre cab V80 and V100 and the later V160 diesel-hydraulics are then shown (on pages 27-41), with the V188 diesel-electrics and the V200.0s following (pages 42-53).

The Köf II and Köf III four-wheel diesel shunters are shown on pages 54 and 55, followed by a shot of the metre gauge V19 on the Kerkerbachbahn and the V29s on the Ludwigshafen - Mundenheim -Meckenheim and later Speyer – Neustadt (Weinstr.), Nagold - Altensteig, and Regensburg - Wörth lines. The later narrow gauge V51 and metre gauge V52 classes are featured on pages 62 and 63, before images of the Krauss-Maffei prototype ML 2200 (later ML 3000) C-C diesel-hydraulic and the Klöckner-Humboldt-Deutz AG (KHD) DG 2000 CCE are shown, as well as one of the General Motors Electro-Motive-Division (GM-EMD) diesel-electric No. 1818 of the United States Army Transportation Corps which was loaned to Bw.Frankfurt (M) Griesheim depot between January and September 1953. The Henschel-built V320 001 is also shown at the head of a test train, so too a couple of

motives on cross-border passenger services in Köln.

Pages 70-142 are devoted to a variety of different types of multiple units, railbuses, and railcars, ranging from the Wismar railbus and the 'Fliegender Hamburger' trains to the VT08 'Eierkopf' (Egghead) units, the articulated VT10s, the TEE VT11.5, and the VT23 and VT24 diesel multiple units. The VT92 501 'Kartoffelkäfer' (potato beetle) railcar and the VT95 and VT98 railbuses are also featured. The final photograph, on page 143, is of overhead catenary maintenance vehicle (Turmtriebwagen) 6225Wt built by Waggon-und Maschinenbau GmbH (WMD).

The book concludes with an advertisement for other volumes in the Carl Bellingrodt photo album series.

This is an excellently produced compilation and can be thoroughly recommended to all those with an interest in German diesel motive power. A reasonable knowledge of the German language will be required to get the best from the descriptive captions but the close-up portrait views will be particularly useful for the modeller.

There has always been a need for depots, Bahnbetriebswerke, for the maintenance of motive power. They provide an important part in the daily operation of a railway and this publication takes a detailed look at their history in Germany. While in steam days roundhouses with turntables, coaling and watering facilities were required, now depots are modern structures catering for the needs of diesel and electric locomotives, railcars, and multiple units. The radical changes to depots are described and illustrated, right up to the present Deutsche Bahn AG and their modern fleet of ICE trains.

The first chapter looks at the rôle of the depot in steam days. Black & white photographs show the different types of sheds, turntables, traversers, coaling plants, water cranes, and sanding towers. There are also track plans showing how these facilities were typically laid out at a depot, and scale drawings of water towers, ash pits, sanding towers, turntables, and traversers. Extracts of paperwork associated with the daily running of these depots are also included.

The second chapter describes and illustrates changes to the depots from the steam era up to the present day, with photos plus scale drawings of diesel fuelling tanks and track plans for the arrangement of fuelling points and sanding towers at a straight road shed. There are also scale drawings for an axle changing machine, a washing plant, and lifting jacks.

Next 'Das Werkstättenwesen heute' presents colour photos and drawings of modern facilities. There is a table showing the Bahnbetriebswerke which have closed on Deutsche Bundesbahn (DB), Deutsche Reichsbahn (DR), and Deutsche Bahn AG (DB AG) since 1990, and a map of Germany shows the site of current main works and depots belonging to DB Cargo, DB Regio, and DB Fernverkehr.

This is followed by a chapter which takes a look at the depots for the upkeep of motive power belonging to private and non-DBAG owned railways, with colour photographs and a map of Germany locating these workshops.

The next section shows how former depots have sadly fallen into ruin, become railway museums, or been used for other purposes. There is a list of standard gauge railway museums in Germany which are based in a former Bahnbetriebswerk.

The next chapter describes in detail the everyday paperwork carried out at Bw Frankfurt (M). There is also an extract from the BR103 electric locomotive diagrams for this depot dating from 1992.

The final chapter gives a thorough listing of all the depots that existed on DR, DB, and DBAG right up to the present day according to the *Direktionen* (administrative divisions). The list includes information about each Bahnbetriebswerk, its fate, current situation, and present ownership. For example, many depots in



the Breslau administrative area passed to Poland and Czechoslovakia after 1945.

This is a highly recommended work on an important part of railway operations, with a wealth of detailed information covering a wide period. Modellers should find it very useful.

There are a number of advertisements for other Eisenbahn Kurier publications and DVDs, and even one for the DB Dampflokwerk in Meiningen.

In 2010 EK-Verlag published a book by Hans-Werner Leder about the TRAXX locomotives. Since then these machines have proved their worth on Europe's railways and the Bombardier works in Kassel has begun production of the third generation. This new edition tells the whole story of the TRAXX family right up to the present day, from the class 185 to the latest multi-voltage TRAXX 3 MS, the class 188, all thoroughly described in words and pictures.

Following an introduction by Dr. Klaus Baur and Wolfgang Tölsner of Bombardier Transportation GmbH, the first chapter covers the development, introduction, and variations of the TRAXX family. Many pictures show locos under construction and outside the Bombardier (formerly Henschel) factory in Kassel. A table of all the different classes within the TRAXX family is included, listing class number and where deployed. For example, the class 185 electrics are in use with DBAG in Germany, SBB in Switzerland, CFL in Luxemburg, and many private operators.

The second section offers photos of the class 145 electrics in use with DB and private companies, all taken from the lineside in sunny weather.

The third chapter is entitled 'Die Entwicklung der TRAXX-Platform für Europa' and here the development of the locomotives is thoroughly described and illustrated, including schematic drawings. Each stage of development is covered and a table shows technical details for the TRAXX DE diesel-electrics.

The next section consists of photos class 146 electrics on a variety of passenger trains, including 146.5s on Inter City services with double-deck stock. This is followed by a chapter on the delivery of classes 145, 146, and 185 to DB and other state railway administrations.

Then another set of photos looks at classes 185 and 186 in use with DB. Some of these show locos which have received advertising vinyls.

The next chapter covers the diesel variant, and includes drawings as well as a photo of the MTU 16V 4000 R41L power unit and the driver's control desk.

The following section provides colour views of class 245 diesel-electrics in use with DB and the Nord Ostseebahn (NOB). A table giving technical details for these locomotives is included as well as schematic drawings; the photographs include some of the ancillary equipment.

The next photo collection covers locos in service with state-owned railways across Europe, such as SBB Cargo of Switzerland, CFL of Luxemburg, SNCB/NMBS of Belgium, RENFE of Spain, and NS in The Netherlands.

The following section shows TRAXX locos in use with private railway companies, among them Rail4Chem, Häfen und Güterverkehr Köln (HGK), ITL Eisenbahngesellschaft, Angel Trains Cargo, Havelländische Eisenbahn AG (HVLE), Lokomotion Gesellschaft für Schienentraktion, Mitsui Rail Capital Europe (MRCE), BeaconRail, Captrain, Akiem, Railpool, Westfälische Landeseisenbahn (WLE), HSL Logistik, EP Cargo, Raildox, Holz-logistik und Güterbahn (HLG), and Metronom.

The chapter 'TRAXX F140 AC3 – Baureihe 187' provides a detailed examination of the TRAXX 3 electric with photographs and line drawings, plus tables giving technical details and the companies currently using them.

A similar chapter deals with the P160 AC3, class 147, and the illustrations include graphic impressions of the driver's control desk, the bogies, and the DF 3610F drive unit.

A further collection of TRAXX locos in service covers the 147 and 187 on DB, in use with private railways, and in countries beyond Germany.

There is also a section on further developments, with photos, schematic drawings, and technical details of the DC3 and MS3.

The final chapter considers the current leasing market with photos of class 185, 186, and 187 locos. A



table of all the leasing companies in Europe using these locos has details correct to March 2018. Further tables show the areas of operation for leasing companies Railpool, Alpha Trains Luxemburg, Akiem, European Locomotive Leasing (ELL), Macquarie Rail, and MRCE Amsterdam/München.

An appendix provides a complete list of all the different companies supplied with TRAXX locos between 1998 and 2018, including class number and date introduced.

As one would expect from this well-known railway publishing house, this is an extremely detailed and well researched work which can be thoroughly recommended to all those with an interest in electric locomotives and their development in Germany.

A good knowledge of the German language will be required to get the best from this publication but the pictures alone adequately show the variety of different types within this loco family and should be very useful for the modeller.

The latest issue of the B.O.R.H.T. *Journal* is the second First World War special.

The main article considers the use by the Railway Operating Division of metre gauge railways in France and Flanders and the rôle they played in suppling the front lines.

There is a small collection of interesting photographs from the Western Front, which should have been included in the Trust's recent magnum opus about military railways overseas during the Great War.

There is also an independent review of this worthy publication, by the manager of the Israel Railway Museum.

Also included is a biography of Lt Col. Sir.

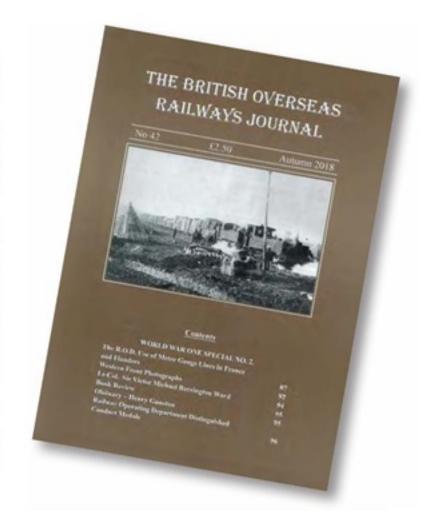
Also included is a biography of Lt.Col. Sir V.M.Barrington-Ward, a career railwayman who was

decorated for his efforts on the supply lines in France and Belgium. Research for this lead to a list of other awards for gallantry to ROD personnel from Britain, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand.

Contents are completed with an obituary for Henry Gunston, an engineer with the Institute of Hydrology who worked in many places overseas; he was closely associated with the Welshpool & Llanfair as well as B.O.R.H.T.

The text is augmented throughout with copious footnotes, appropriately in the manner of an academic journal, literally at the bottom of each page. As the space required for this varies, it might have been useful to use a typeface that was less like the body copy, or place the notes within a framed box or on a lightly tinted background. The page layout is sometimes a little wayward: for example, the portraits of Barrington-Ward appear to be appended to the preceding metre gauge article. However, such small technical considerations do not detract from the inherent interest of the material.

The narrow gauge railways of Mayenne

There was a time, from the last decade of the 19th century until the 1930s, before the age of road transport, when most of rural France was served by a large number of secondary railways, effectively filling in the gaps on the map and acting as feeders for the main lines and major through routes. They were important to the local population and often played a significant rôle in developing agriculture and industry, though rarely in the long term profitable in themselves. The majority have not survived, except in local memory and old photographs – and in some of the buildings which still stand, evidence of the minor railway past to those who recognise it.

This new book tells the story of just such a system, the metre gauge network in the département of Mayenne, which ran from 1900 to 1947, connecting Laval (on the Ouest line from Paris Montparnasse to Rennes) with Mayenne and Landivy, later extended to St. Hilaire du Harcouet.

In keeping with the author's established format, the book consists mostly of old postcards, reproduced two or three to the page at close to original size and as well as the originals will allow, complete with stamps and handwriting in some cases. They are mostly black & white, though reproduced with various tints, and some are hand-coloured. They are augmented by

archive photographs, and the occasional recent view (of surviving structures, for example). In some views the railway is almost incidental, in others the new infrastructure and novel machinery are very much the centre of attention.

There are several aerial photos, with pertinent features helpfully indicated with overlaid coloured arrows.

Each image is accompanied by a caption or informative notes. The original description is visible on many of the cards.

They are arranged in geographical order along the line.

The supporting maps and track diagrams are schematic, produced on computer, in a limited range of colours, but of adequate resolution and fine for the purpose. Community coats-of-arms (in colour) are inserted where relevant.

There is a scale drawing of a Corpet Louvet 0-6-0T. The presentation is in a plain style.

The text does not have any accents, having been produced on an English keyboard.

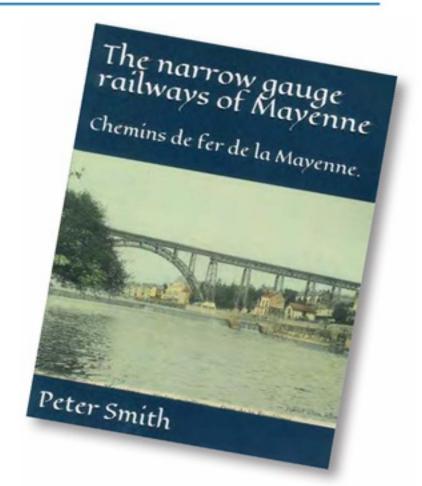
The work is completed with a selection of photos of the preserved *Cambrai*, a very similar loco to those used on the Mayenne lines.

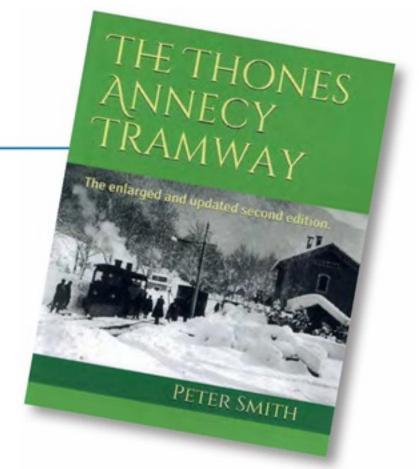
This collection represents a significant amount of research in secondary sources and quite a feat of compilation, finding and bringing together so many historic images. Indeed, it seems surprising that such out of the way places should have been photographed at all. The atmosphere is wonderful, and should provide perfect inspiration for modellers, allowing for the commercial scarcity of authentic stock in any scale.

The Thones – Annecy Tramway

This is an enlarged and updated second edition of a book which appeared at the end of 2013 (see review in CM April 2014). More information and illustrations have been found in the subsequent five years, prompting the production of a new edition. The Thones to Annecy Tramway only operated from 1898 to 1930 but was instrumental in opening up the mountainous region on the edge of the alps in Haute Savoie for winter sports and summer holidays.

The book describes the tramway in great detail, using maps, plans, photos, postcards, and facsimile documents, in the same manner as the author's other publications. Almost nothing of the line remains today, so this is an important record.

Allowing for that fact that there is little or no suitable stock available commercially, there are many scenes here that might inspire a model.

Die Baureihe 250

- Der 'Energiecontainer'

In 1974 LEW Hennigsdorf delivered three prototypes of the new class 250 electrics for the Deutsche Reichsbahn (DR). These heavy six-axle locomotives were built for freight but also with the intention of working passenger trains. From 1977 to 1984 a total of 270 production series locomotives were built. Under the combined DB and DR numbering scheme, they became class 155. Since then many have been withdrawn or have been sold on to

locomotive hiring companies such as Railpool; currently there are none in Deutsche Bahn ownership.

The story of these interesting locomotives is chronicled in historic DR scenes, with film obtained in the driving cabs and at main works. The story is brought up to date showing use with private companies as well as being hired back to DBAG.

They were nicknamed 'Energiecontainers' due to their boxy construction with ribbed body sides and high power output.

Coverage begins with scenes of a traffic red (*Verkehrsrot*) 155 at the head of a goods train. Aerial views show other 155s, including one on a train of fuel tanks, and others are seen on a variety of freight workings, including some MEG-owned machines in the Rhine Valley.

Examples in the earlier orient red livery are then shown, including one on fuel tanks passing a level crossing. Carrying the original DR Bordeaux red, 250 137 is shown up close and the driver is interviewed and takes viewers on a guided tour of this particular locomotive. We then see prototype 155 001, with larger cab front windows, in orient red livery, followed by 155 045 in PRESS blue livery at Halle (Saale) with a long train of fuel tanks and Erfurter Bahn Service GmbH black 155 007 is also shown close up.

Archive colour film then shows 250s in Bordeaux red under construction, followed by black & white scenes of the class at work on a variety of freight and some passenger trains in DR service. An unidentified 250 is seen at Bw Cottbus moving off the turntable, followed by 250 181 on a train of concrete sleepers and vans. Others are seen in action in the snow filmed from the lineside, including 155 224, and 155 249 is seen running light. There are also scenes in the cab, including of 155 030.

Double-headed 155s are then seen working a freight, filmed from the lineside, and in the Frankenwald another loco still sporting the Bordeaux red livery is seen on a

container train at Probstzella. Another 155 is seen with double-deck passenger stock in the snow. At Reichenbach (Vogtland) one is seen arriving with a passenger service and further scenes show similar workings, all in the snow.

Aerial views show 155s on 'Silverfish' coaches, with 155 054 being observed in Bordeaux red at Dresden Hbf. Further passenger trains hauled by 155s were filmed from the lineside, including some in orient red on Inter Regio services in the 1990s. It is then back to freights, including footage along the Rhine valley, while at Jüterbog an orient red 155 passes with a mixed freight

At Werk Dessau 155s are seen undergoing overhauls, and ex-works 155 080 is observed here on test while another is seen starting a heavy train of VTG tank wagons.

Next is succession of different freights in the hands of 155s, including some double-headed along the Rhine valley line. In the Ruhr, 155s are seen on freights, including loaded car-carrying trains. At Großkorbetha 155 150 is seen leaving on a heavy train of bogie hopper, and another hauls bogie gas tanks. At Falkenberg a 155 is seen on a train of VTG bogie tanks, and 155 245 on a similar working.

Mannheim-based machines are seen on freights in the Stuttgart area, including 155 039 at Kornwestheim Pbf. as it restarts a mixed freight away from the station. At Mannheim depot we see 155 261 receiving a wash, while on the Berlin Aussenring 155 147 is seen with a mixed freight. 155 178 is also shown on a mixed freight between Berlin and Magdeburg, and at Seelze a 155 is observed arriving with a train of bogie tanks. In Berlin a 155 is seen on a train loaded with pipes being passed by an ICE-1 set. Further action filmed around the capital shows 155 123 passing Berlin Wannsee on a mixed freight, while at Gremberg near Köln 155 084 is seen running light and stabling on shed. Prototype 155 001 is also seen here, as well as preserved 250 250 in DR Bordeaux red.

The programme closes with yet more scenes of 155s in action on freight services filmed from the lineside; those shown include 155 083 and 155 099. There is also more of the interview with the driver.

Picture quality is excellent, as might be expected from EK. The production team have done a good job in compiling material from their extensive collection plus archive footage to create a rounded portrait of the class.

The commentary is only available in German.

Some background music is used during the programme but it is not too obtrusive. The Eisenbahn Kurier railway video library is published by EK-Verlag, Lörracher Straße 16, D-79115 Freiburg, Germany. www.eisenbahn-kurier.de



Die Eisenbahn in Hamburg – damals

The variety of different types of motive power is documented in historic archive film from Hamburg Hbf., Hamburg-Altona, in Hamburg-Rothenburgsort, and on the lines radiating from these locations.

The programme begins with an introduction and film from Rainer Hartmann on the lines out of Hamburg Hbf. We see the departure of a Deutsche Reichsbahn class 01⁵ Pacific on a passenger service to Berlin, with a V200⁰ diesel-hydraulic running into the station in the background. 01 503 is then seen arriving

and departing Hamburg Hbf. on another passenger howing the Boxpok driving wheels. Another 015 is

service, clearly showing the Boxpok driving wheels. Another 01⁵ is seen arriving with yet another leaving for Berlin. 01 527 was also filmed from the lineside on a passenger working.

Next we see film from Ekkehard Böhnlein with more scenes of 01⁵s on passenger services arriving and departing Hamburg, including 01 508 and 01 525. At Hamburg-Altona one is seen leaving on a train of Deutsche Bundesbahn *Silberlinge* stock with a DB 103 electric clearly seen in the background waiting to leave on an express.

More film from Rainer Hartmann shows a DB 01 Pacific departing Hamburg-Altona on a train for Westerland (Sylt). At Hamburg-Rothenburgsort depot we see a variety of steam locos on shed, including DB classes 094 (0-10-0T), 050 (2-10-0) and 023 (2-6-2). Later shots show some of these withdrawn and awaiting their fate. 094s are seen running light and shunting, including 094 818. This is followed by archive film shot around Hamburg Hbf. by Frank Etzold. We see a local S-Bahn train passing and at Hamburg-Eidelstedt a DB 012 Pacific is seen passing with a passenger service.

Further film form Rainer Hartmann then shows some of the private railways in Schleswig-Holstein with scenes of the Altona-Kaltenkirchen-Neumünster (AKN) MANbuilt diesel railcars in action. At Kaltenkirchen we see inside the AKN works with locomotives and units inside the shed. Further scenes of show MAN railbuses filmed from the lineside.

The Elmshorn-Barmstedt-Oldesloer-Eisenbahn (EBOE) is shown at Elsmhorn with a VT98 railbus and trailer and at Barmstedt we get a look inside the depot.

Next we see film by Rainer Pohl showing the rail routes from Hamburg to Lübeck and Hamburg to Büchen. At Büchen (a border station) a heavy freight working is seen

departing behind a DR BR50 bound for East Germany. Another 50 is seen arriving with a train of tank wagons and a DB BR221 diesel-hydraulic can just be seen in the background in the station. A DR BR118 diesel-hydraulic is then shown and another 50 is seen from the lineside on a mixed freight.

We then move to Flensburg where film by Ekkehard Böhnlein shows a 50 being replenished with coal, sand, and water at the depot. Pacific 012 077 is seen leaving the roundhouse and moving onto the turntable. Later this loco is seen leaving Flensburg station on a passenger train bound for Hamburg and a class 094 is seen running light from the depot, with another at Flensburg-Weiche yard. A 50 is also seen passing and later departs from the yard with a heavy freight. At Flensburg station an 094 is seen pushing a train of passenger coaches out of the platform with further examples of this class stabled at Flensburg depot.

We then see film from Hamburg-Altona shed with 012s departing the station on passenger trains to Westerland (Sylt). At Itzehoe more 012s were filmed on passenger services.

At Husum we see a BR515 battery railcar on a local service, amongst views of the town's harbour and fishing fleet. At Niebüll a BR012 arrives and a Danish railmotor is seen arriving from Tønder.

More of Rainer Hartmann's film shows the branch from Niebüll to Dagebüll. At the terminus, Dagebüll Mole, we see a ferry for the North Sea islands of Föhr and Amrun; further scenes show a diesel railcar running round ready for its return journey to Niebüll, with film from inside the cab.

Further material from Ekkerhard Böhnlein at Westerland (Sylt) shows 012s, as well as scenes of these locos at work at Niebüll and along the Hindenburgdamm. A V200^o diesel-hydraulic is seen crossing the Hindenburgdamm at the head of a car carrying train, and at Westerland (Sylt) station 012 080 is seen arriving with a passenger service from Hamburg. Another 012 is then shown pushing empty stock out of the terminus.

At Westerland (Sylt) depot another 012 is seen on the turntable with a V2000 visible on shed. The metre gauge Sylter Inselbahn is represented with scenes of their diesel units in action and the depot. An unusual turn of a BR012 at the head of a freight train is then seen departing from Westerland (Sylt) with a V60 0-6-0 diesel shunter visible in the background. As a bonus there is film shot in winter by Ekkerhard Böhlein of steam-hauled services on the Hamburg – Westerland (Sylt) main line.

There is background music but it is tastefully done and not at all obtrusive.

Information from Continental Modeller



Warley show reports significantly increased attendance

Hall 5 of the National Exhibition Centre was buzzing on Saturday 24th and Sunday 25th November with the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition. Exhibition Manager Paul Jones reports that there was a 10% increase in advance ticket sales, leading to a noticeable rise in attendance.

Among the awards, the CONTINENTAL MODELLER trophy (for the best overseas outline layout) went to Four Feather Falls (US On30) by members of Cupar & District MRC. The presentation was made by pop music mogul and noted railway enthusiast Pete Waterman.

The choice of favourite layout by the incumbent Mayor of Sandwell, this year Councillor Joy Edis, went to Nigel Tansley for his 7mm narrow gauge First World War layout Q Dump.

The prototype displays included the recently-restored 2' gauge Hunslet 4-6-0T (courtesy of the War Office Locomotive Trust) and – from Statfold



Engineering Ltd. – 1922-built 2' gauge Hudswell Clarke Alpha, which originally operated at the Ryam Sugar Company system in Bihar.

During the weekend we took the opportunity to photograph some of the forthcoming models displayed by Rapido Trains. These included a decorated sample of the Royal Hudson steam loco-

motive, production samples of the Santa Fe Budd RDC set, and a hand-painted sample of the GE B36-7 in Conrail blue. (Note, however, that road number #5037 is not one of the identities being produced.)

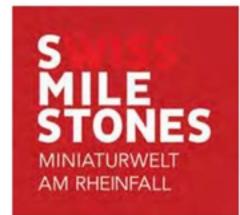

Ken Smith

It was with shock and great sadness that we learnt of the sudden death of Ken Smith, builder of Wyandotte Siding (CM November 2014). On Saturday 13th October he suffered a stroke and was rushed to hospital. Although initial indications were good, things deteriorated during the following week and he died on Friday 19th.

Kenneth Edward Smith was born in Oldham on 19th November 1946. Together with his younger brother, he showed an interest in trains and this was encouraged by their father, who was also an enthusiast. Ken always maintained that it was the visits to an aunt who lived close to a footbridge over the busy lines at Llandudno Junction that really attracted him to railways. As a teenager in the 1960s, Ken went searching for endangered species: steam engines and butterflies.

At school Ken showed an aptitude for languages and went on to study French at university. This led to a career teaching French.

His second wife June is from the United States and they lived in Chico, Northern California, from 1998 to 2001. Ken became interested in American trains and joined the local High Sierra Model Railroad Club. Returning to England with a selection of American HO equipment, the seed was sown for a layout.

Through the Wells Railway Fraternity, Ken met Chris Challis. When Chris heard about Ken's plans to build a layout, a deadline was set in the form of an invitation to exhibit at Railwells in 2008. Wyandotte Siding duly appeared with two scenic boards, a 4'6" traverser one end, and a loco traverser at the other. This was purely for switching operations. Another scenic baseboard and a second traverser were both added before the layout reached its final oval form with staging tracks at the rear. The layout appeared in this form at Railwells in 2015 and usually had one or two outings to exhibitions around the country each year. The last occasion was at Bristol (Thornbury) in May 2018 when Ken was awarded a trophy for the best scenery on a layout.

At the celebration of Ken's life on 9th November, David McLaughlin, President of the British Region of the National Model Railroad Association, presented June with a certificate recognising Ken's contribution to North American railroad modelling in this country.

Among other things he had been involved in the local twinning association, where in addition to being valued for his language skills he was credited with advancing the ties between Shepton Mallet and the twinned towns of Oisselsur-Seine in France and Misburg in Germany.

We extend our condolences to Ken's wife June, his children Simon and Sarah, and his brother Phil. Ken and Phil's father died at the end of last year but until then they had both been involved with building and maintaining his O gauge garden railway.

Roy Hirst

We are saddened to report that Roy Hirst passed away in October 2018. Roy will be known for his First World War layout 1918 – behind the lines, which was featured in the July 2018 issue of CM. He developed it into a comprehensive record of the stock and personnel involved with light railways in the Great War.

Roy was a qualified cabinet maker and started his military interest as a member of the Napoleonic Association. His brother-in-law was in the Royal Engineers, and family holidays were spent touring the battlefields of WW1 and WW2. All these connections sparked the amalgamation of his interest in trains, France, WW1, and modelling.

He was proficient at creating museum quality models that looked great and ran well. He had articles published in a number of magazines, and at shows he excelled at connecting with the public and explaining about his modelling, research, and where information could be found.

Our sympathies to his wife Tracy and son Tom.
