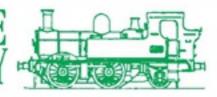

Corona virus (Covid-19) situation

We would normally be using this month's editorial to extol the virtues of two exhibitions of particular interest to those modelling overseas railways – Derby, in the middle of the month, which always has a worthwhile foreign section, and Globalrail, the German Railway Society's specialist event, on the last Saturday of the month.

However, these, like most other public events large and small, have been cancelled or postponed due to the health risk situation, in some cases looking as far ahead as late June. Those due to take place in schools, colleges, and public buildings will have had little choice.

If they had been able to go ahead, it is probable that some exhibitors and traders might have been reluctant to attend, and attendance might have been low. It is unfortunate, but no doubt sensible given the general age profile of many participants in the hobby – even if many of them tend to exhibit the classic 'keep calm and carry on' mentality!

As a result there is no Exhibition Diary in this issue, as so many events will not be taking place, in line with government advice. Regrettable but inevitable.

We hope that the situation does not deteriorate to such an extent that advice has to be replaced by something stronger, as has been seen in other countries.

Not holding an annual show will mean a loss of important revenue for some groups. though of course such considerations are not as significant as the loss of livelihood and income for individuals or businesses.

Asking people to restrict their social contacts will also affect other aspects of club life.

Model Train Expo OntraXS! in Utrecht was cancelled on the day before it was due to open, following the Dutch government's sudden and immediate ban on meetings of over one hundred people: exhibitors and traders were already in the hall setting up.

The large show in Mannheim and the specialist O gauge event in Gießen were also stopped, though the latter has already proposed an alternative date in October. Likewise, Intermodellbau in Dortmund has been postponed from April until late August – we sincerely hope the situation has improved by then.

We intend to keep producing the magazines normally for as long as we can; it is proving possible if not ideal to work remotely at home, now that has become advisable.

We have of course curtailed excursions to photograph layouts either in clubrooms or private homes. This may mean that articles planned for some way ahead have to be changed, but fortunately we have a good stock of material in hand. Much is already in digital form, at various stages of the production process.

E-mails are getting through but for now the telephones are not manned.

Our printers do not foresee production problems at the moment, though one can imagine that distribution to shops may be affected by the need to prioritise essential supplies. Also, readers may feel it is not wise to venture out. Remember copies can be ordered on line, and subscription copies will continue to be sent out.

It had been hoped to continue production at Peco, but eventually it was deemed sensible to stop, primarily to ensure staff could be protected. The company did offer to assist with the manufacture of ventilators/respirators and protective equipment if technically feasible.

Inevitably, Pecorama has also been closed for the time being.

On the positive side, if we are obliged to stay at home, it might be a good time to get on with some modelling! It can be light relief and good therapy.

We hope all our readers, contributors, advertisers, and suppliers can keep well at this troubling time.

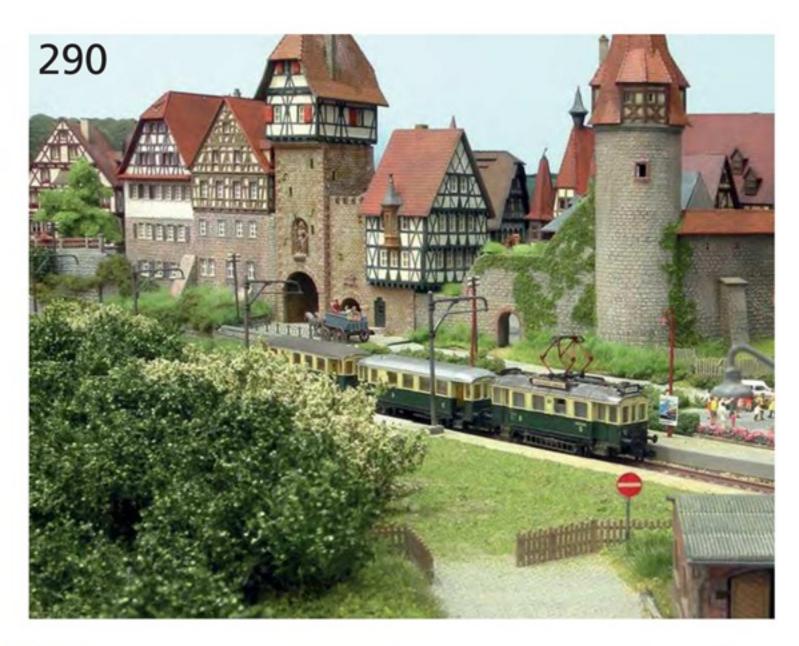

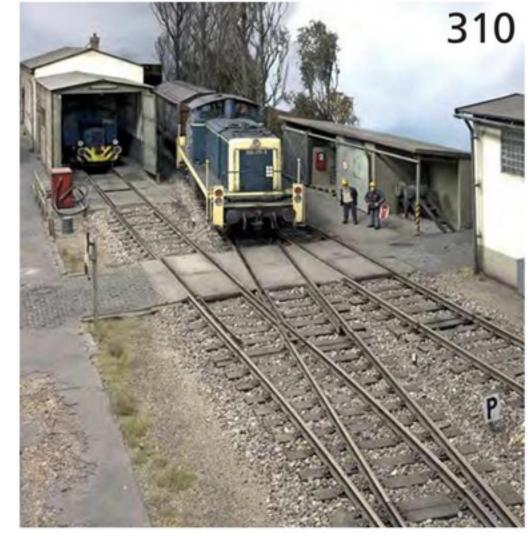

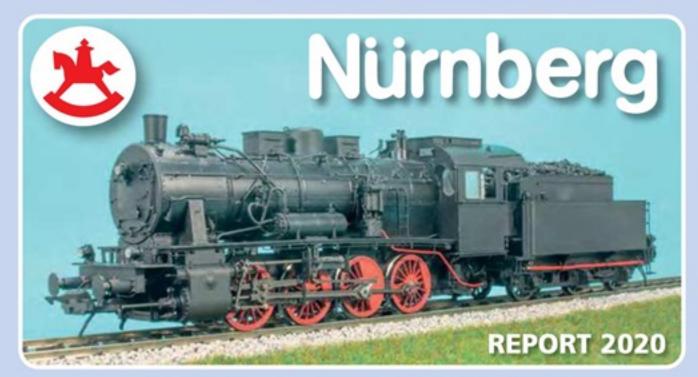

As in previous years, we cannot hope to mention everything that was shown: manufacturers use the event to promote their complete ranges to trade customers, and so the scope of the model railway section of the Nürnberg trade fair is too large. We have tried to include what are, in our opinion, significant and interesting new products.

We should point out that our illustrations have been derived from manufacturers' information as well as our own photography. Readers should be aware that some pictures may have been retouched, and the final models may differ in detail.

We would also point out that a mention in the report is the result of gathering information or hastily inspecting a sample at a trade fair, and should not be taken as a full and considered review of the finished product.

The news of many of these products is by way of advance information, and the mention of any item should not be taken to mean that it is available.

Similarly, estimates of delivery dates should only be taken as an approximate guide based on stated intentions. Readers must await coverage in our 'Latest Reviews' or announcements in retailers' advertisements which will indicate when particular models can be purchased. Enquiries should be directed to the relevant supplier, not the Editorial office!

This report is compiled quickly immediately after the Fair and we apologise in advance for any errors or omissions. We hope such failings will be minor and not detract from your enjoyment of what we believe is the most complete English-language coverage of the model railway section of the Nürnberg Spielwarenmesse.

A BRIEF GUIDE TO THE EPOCH DATING SYSTEM

The following terms are used in our report:

EPOCH I – approximately 1870 to 1920; vehicles in the liveries

of the separate state and private railways.

EPOCH II – approximately 1920 to 1945,

from the formation of the large national state networks (DRG, BBÖ, SBB, etc).

EPOCH III - approximately 1945 to 1968.

EPOCH IV - approximately 1968 to 1994;

vehicles with UIC computer numbering.

EPOCH V – 1994 to 2006, from the foundation of DBAG, formation of private railway operating companies, and Europe-wide liberalisation of railway traffic.

EPOCH VI – introduction of new Europe-wide UIC vehicle numbers with a country-specific code, starting 2007.







Z 1:220 Scale -

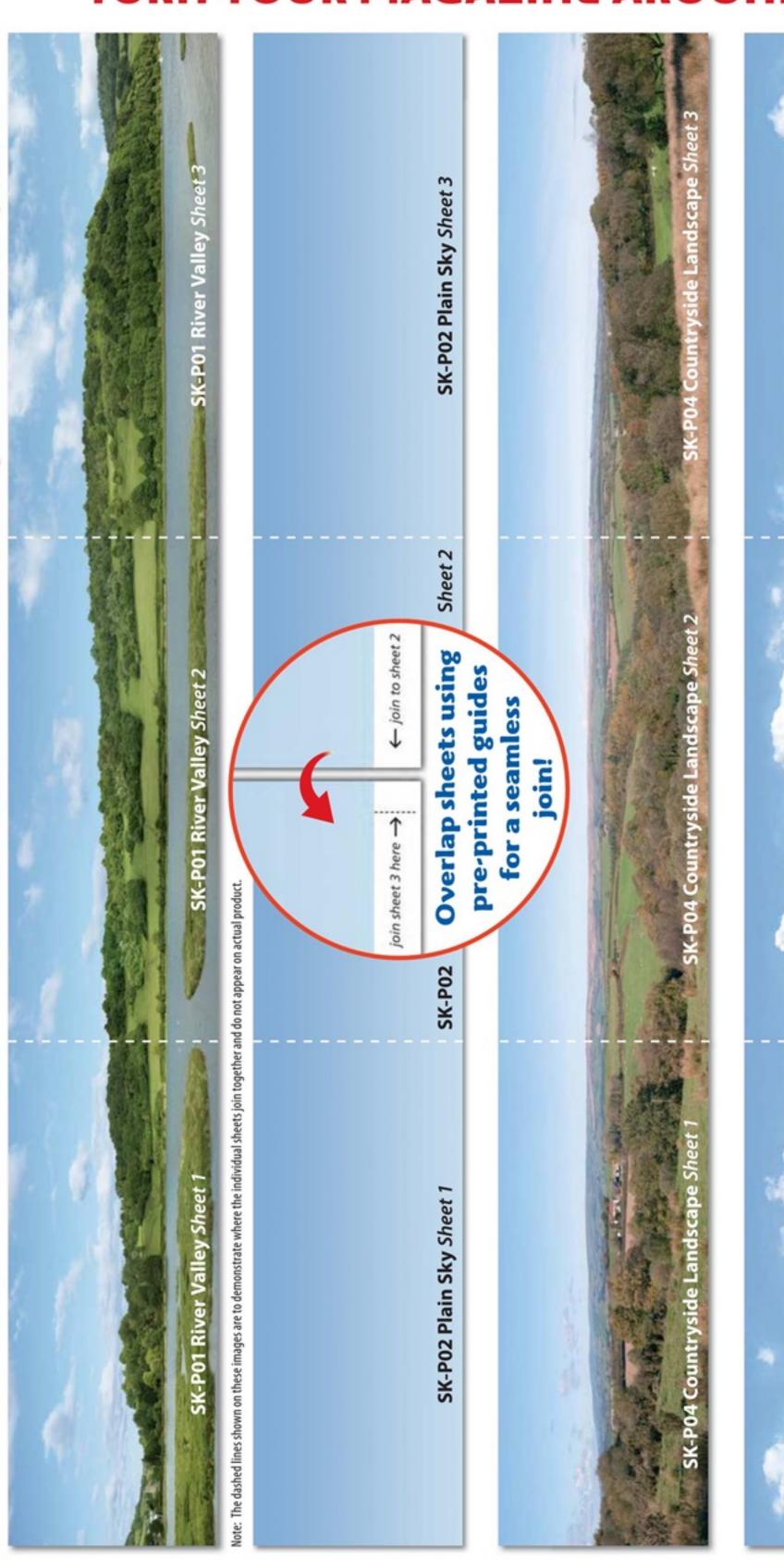

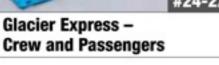

GOOD NEWS! - good NEW DVDs!

Two Foot Narrow Gauge in East Germany -The Mecklenburg Pommersche Narrow Gauge Railway 1966-196

App 50 mins • B&W and colour • Stereo Sound • £20.77 In this film you see operations during its final years on the last surving 36 km long segment of the Mecklenburg Pommersche Schmalspurbahn between Anklam and Friedland in eastern Germany; whilst trains ran the full length of the route, locomotives were changed roughly midway, at Wegzin-Dennin. You see the unusual coaches, as well as the six locomotives which



hauled them. Three of these were very pretty little 0-6-2s built by Jung in 1906-1908 and three were 0-8-0s, built by Vulcan and O&K between the wars. Amazingly all six survive in preservation today, with one of the Jung 0-6-2s a long time resident on the Brecon Mountain Railway in South Wales. All shot by Ton and his friends, with sound recorded on location, expertly dubbed. Much of interest, for NG railway modellers.

Mussorgsky in Steam -**Ballet for Men and Machines**

App 35 mins • B&W and colour • Stereo Sound • £19.32 A UNIQUE LISTENING AND VIEWING EXPERIENCE!

Here Ton Pruissen takes a piece of classical music which has no connection at all with the steam locomotive or railways, and adds to it clips of railway scenes and steam locomotives to accompany the mood of the music. We were dubious as to how it could work, but work it does, very satisfyingly. The music is the Russian composer Modest Mussorgsky's most famous



piece, "Pictures at an Exhibition" composed in 1874. The railway film segments come from Indonesia, India, Zimbabwe, Turkey, East and West Germany, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary and Rumania. Mussorgsky's composition and Ton's film making and editing skills combine memorably in this lovely film. May be played with stero sound, or Surround Sound.

Reichsbahn Pacifics 1967-1991

App 30 mins • B&W and colour • Stereo Sound • £19.32 East Germany's Deutsche Reichsbahn continued to modernise and develop its steam locomotive fleet into the 1960s. In particular there were the handsome, heavily rebuilt and modernised 01 locomotives of the 01 5 class, many with Boxpok wheels, some with Giesl ejectors and all semistreamlined. All three classes of Pacific are seen at East Berlin's Ostbohnhof and Friedrichstrasse stations, before we go to the frontier station of Eisenach where two"Interzonenzüge" (trains between East and West



Germany) are seen hauled by 01 5 Pacifics, strangely being helped by class 44 decapods. At Stralsund on the Baltic coast we see the oil-fired three cylinder Pacifics of class 03.10, before we see more of this class at Pasewalk. The next stop is Pasewalk, with arrivals and departures of express trains, and a lot of atmosphere. Finally we go to Dresden and surroundings in 1977 during the last weeks of express steam on the Berlin to Dresden line, with Pacifics of classes 01 and 01.5. App. 30 mins. Very well shot B&W and colour footing, with on location stereo sound dubbed in as only Ton Pruissen can do it.

PLUS - from CATERARY YESS PRESSET LAS

"Skookum" and "CV-4"

App 60 mins • B&W and colour • Stereo Sound • £20.77 This fascinating programme tells the story of two rare operating Mallet locomotives to be found on the 10 mile preserved Niles Canyon Railway: the 1909 "Skookum" (2-4-4-2), and the 1924 "Clover Valley #4" (2-6-6-2). The "Skookum" had a very varied career on logging railroads until rescued as a derelict, and finally restored fifty years later, looking as good as new. The "Clover Valley #4" hauled logs in Northern California and,



upon retirement, came to Niles Canyon, underwent major repairs, and is now also running. Rare archival footage details the past of both engines. Also included is footage of the SP 4-6-2 No. 2472, and a steam quadruple header; 60 minutes of action and information for you to enjoy! Unlike other Catenary Video Productions which are almost exclusively archive film, this DVD is largely digital footage shot in 2019, with limited archive material.

Western Pacific: The First Fifty Years: 1910 to 1960 Volume Two: California Zephyr

72 minutes • Colour • Stereo Sound • £20.77

In essence this tells the story of the Western Pacific's long distance passenger services between Oakland and Salt Lake City, with much of this DVD devoted to the famed California Zephyr. The "Silver Lady", was to be the very last of the classic American stainless steel streamliners offering de-luxe service on its run from Chicago to Oakland - a service run by WP with the Burlington and the D&RGW. Wonderful archive film!

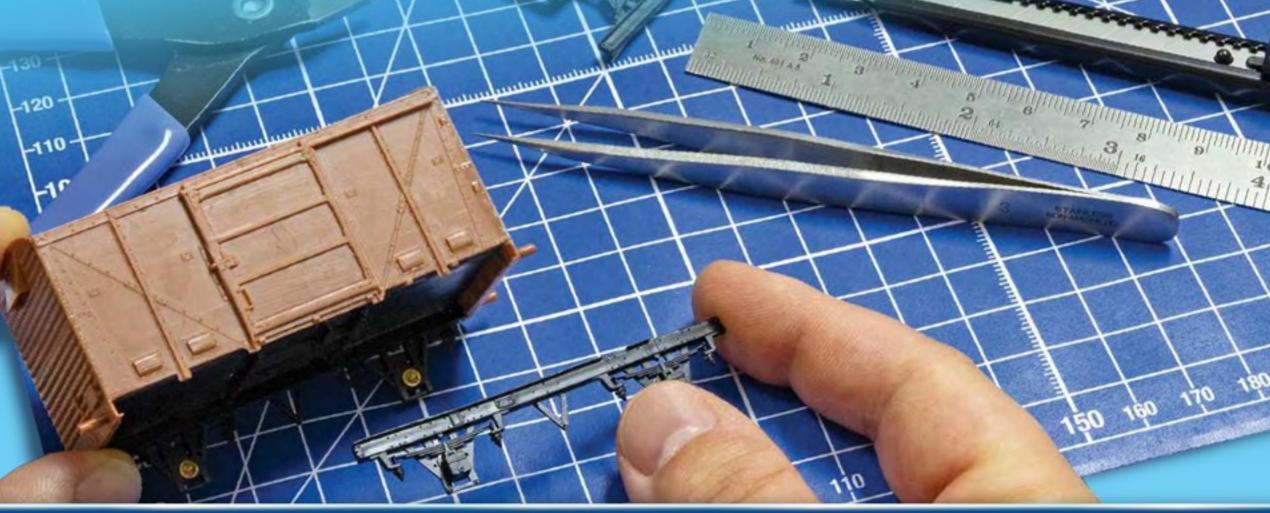

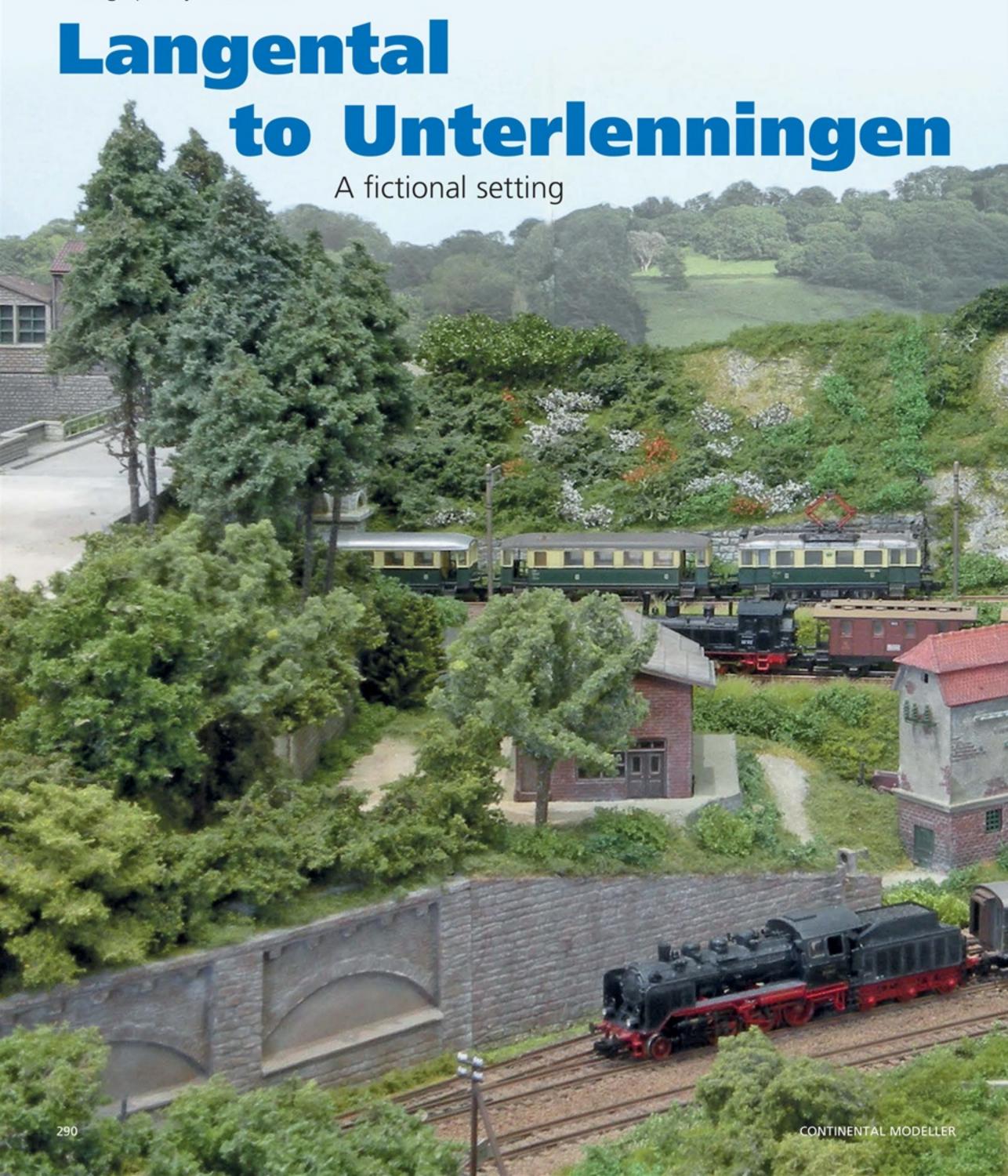

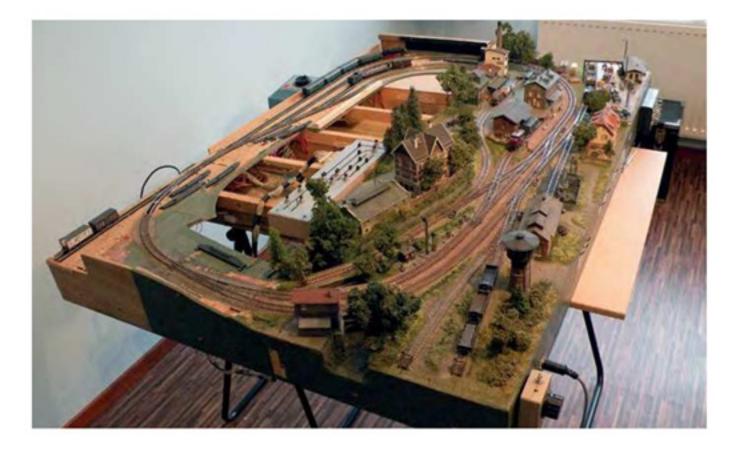
have been busy building a model railway in N for many years. First there was a modest layout of 1.2m x 0.8m, the construction of which dates back to the end of the 1990s.

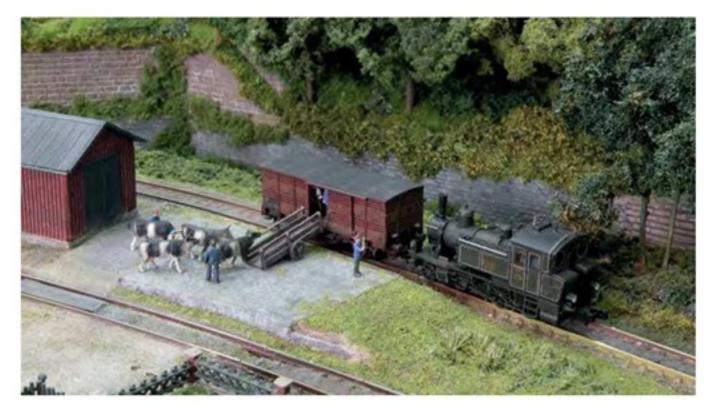
That was seen at a few model railway events at the start of this century. From the outset, expansion was planned but due to other model rail activities this had to wait until 2008. Many ideas and plans preceded the new project.

The layout as developed, with lines on three levels: the main line at the front, the middle branch climbing to Unterlenningen (to the left), and (top) the extension to Gustavberg (to the right)







The first layout was a simple oval divided into two pieces. The front was initially the 'visible part' and the rear disappeared behind a painted background.

Langental station was built in the visible section, 1.2m x 0.4m. Behind the backscene there was (and still is) a storage yard. The whole thing was finished with a valance behind which lighting was concealed. Setting up the entire construction took very little time, and that proved to be useful at exhibitions.

A lot of shunting options were provided at the station. Technically, everything was kept very simple. The points in Langental station, and later also on the extension, were operated with simple rods. Points where this system could not be fitted have electric drives. Switching the frog polarity was planned from the outset. A number of track sections can be turned off with switches to be able to park locomotives. Everything very classic and basic.

When construction started, digital control was not usual, so operation of the layout was analogue – and so it has remained, so far.

A side note: in contrast to the poor running qualities of older N gauge locomotives, much has changed for the better in that respect in recent years. To 'revive' older stock, a number of locomotives have been fitted with Faulhaber coreless motors. The transformation makes them a pleasure to drive much more reliably even in this small scale, above all for shunting. In combination with a good controller, this is now an extraordinary experience.

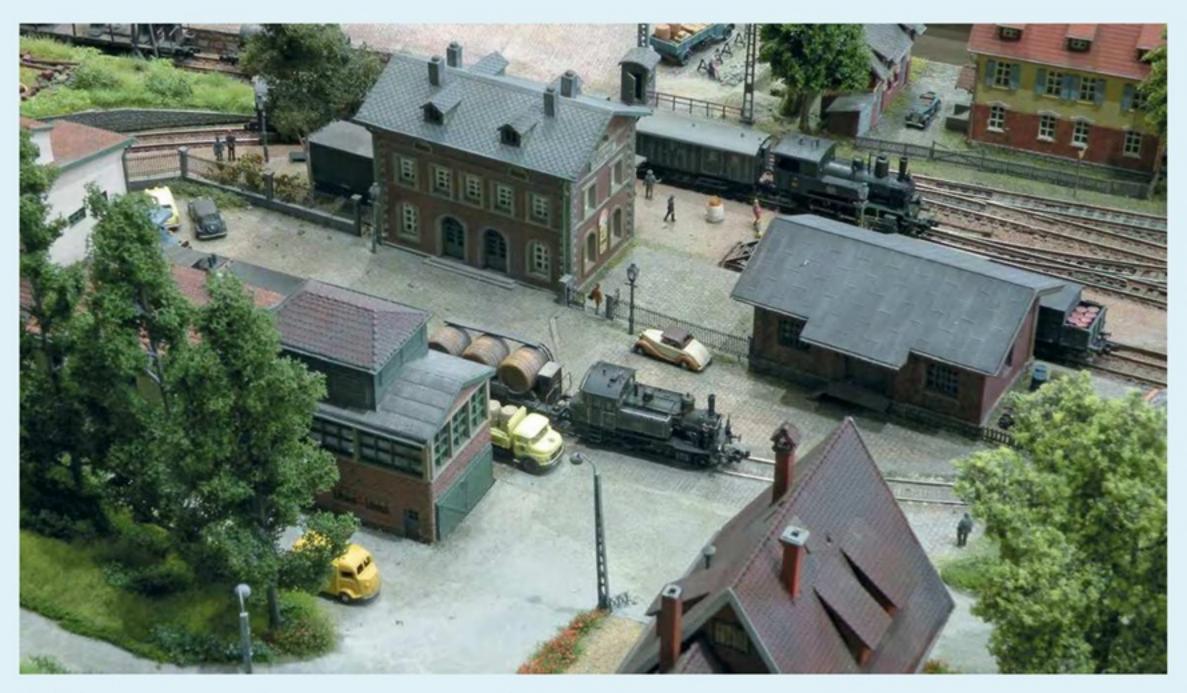

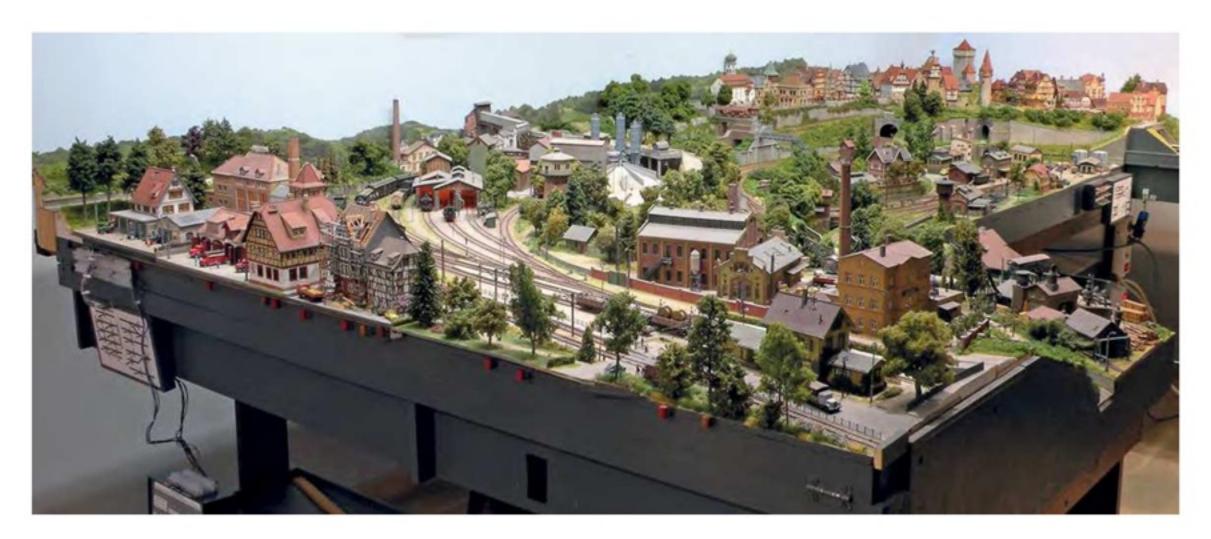

Theme and period

The entire layout is set in a fictional landscape, and the track plan is not based on any existing real situation. Moreover, the date is not too strict – it may run from the Landerbahn (Epoch I) to the Deutsche Reichsbahn (Epoch III), well into the 1950s. Everything is possible as long as I enjoy it. Driving trains and shunting is just as important as building the scenery.





Major expansion

As already mentioned in the introduction, it took until 2008 for the expansion plans to take shape. But in the end an adventure started that claimed more than ten years of my model building time. The attached plan clearly shows that Langental was the core around which the rest of the layout was built.

The only thing that was certain was the track plan. The interpretation of the landscape was always a challenge to add something new. The inspiration of the moment was often decisive for further development.

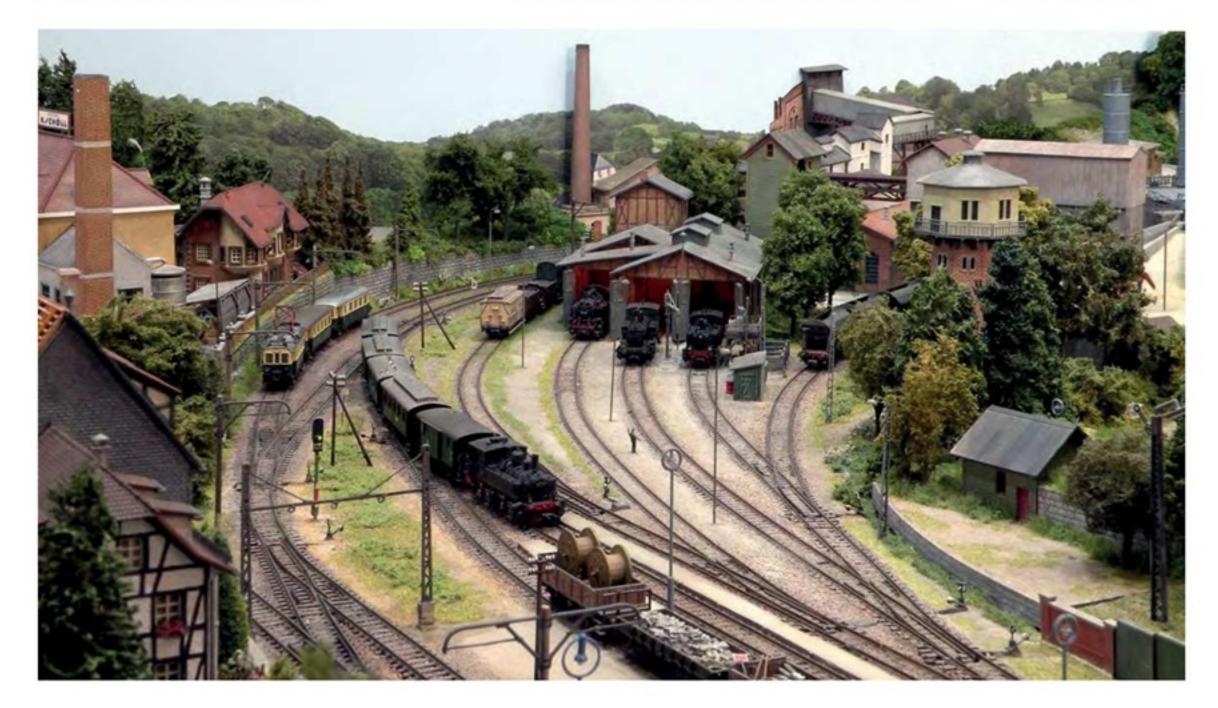
The entire set-up was also a challenge from a technical point of view. That started with the modular construction – just like Langental, the rest of the layout was made of divisible pieces. This construction paid off a few years ago when we moved house. The whole layout could be effortlessly re-assembled at the new address. But despite this divisible design, it is virtually impossible to participate in exhibitions with the whole layout.

Due to the arrangement of the landscape, large parts of the tracks run 'underground'. The use of climbing spirals was not considered, so that the difference in level between above Ahove

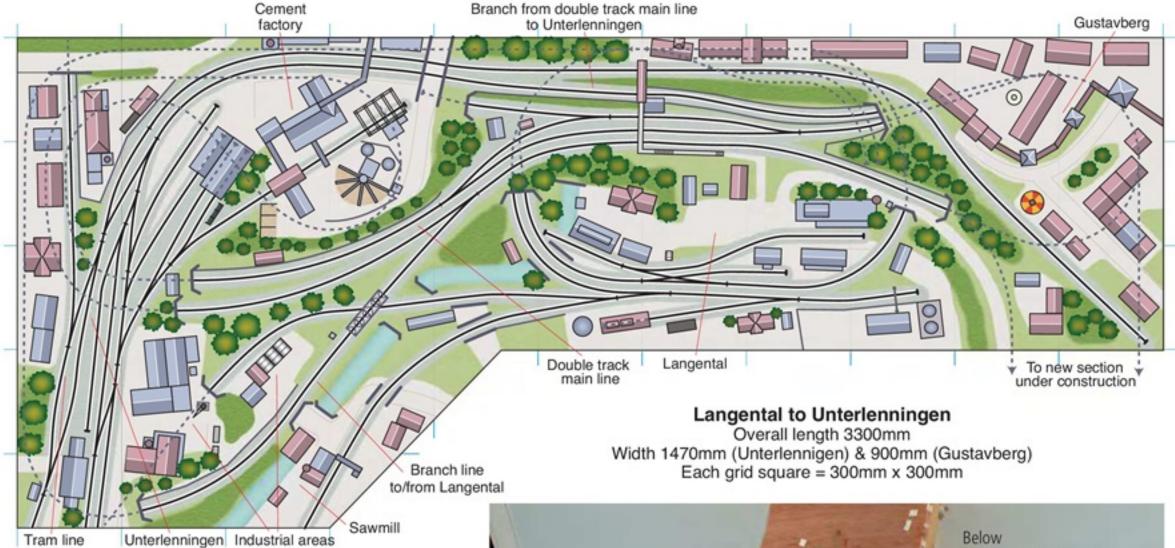
Almost the whole layout after expansion, from Unterlenningen over Langental to Gustavberg.

Unterlenningen yard, with a passenger train arriving from Langental and the tram coming from Gustavberg.



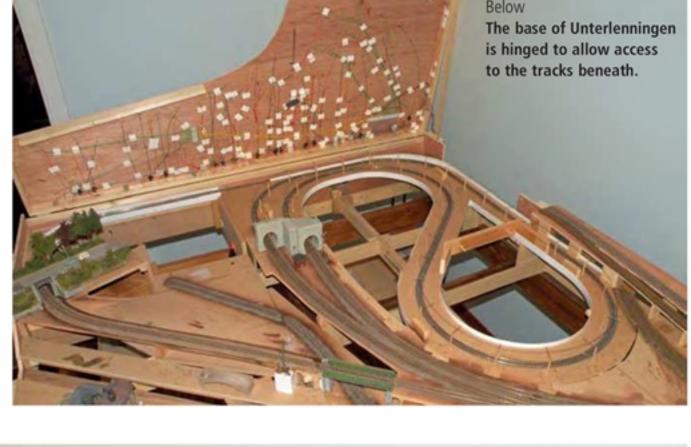

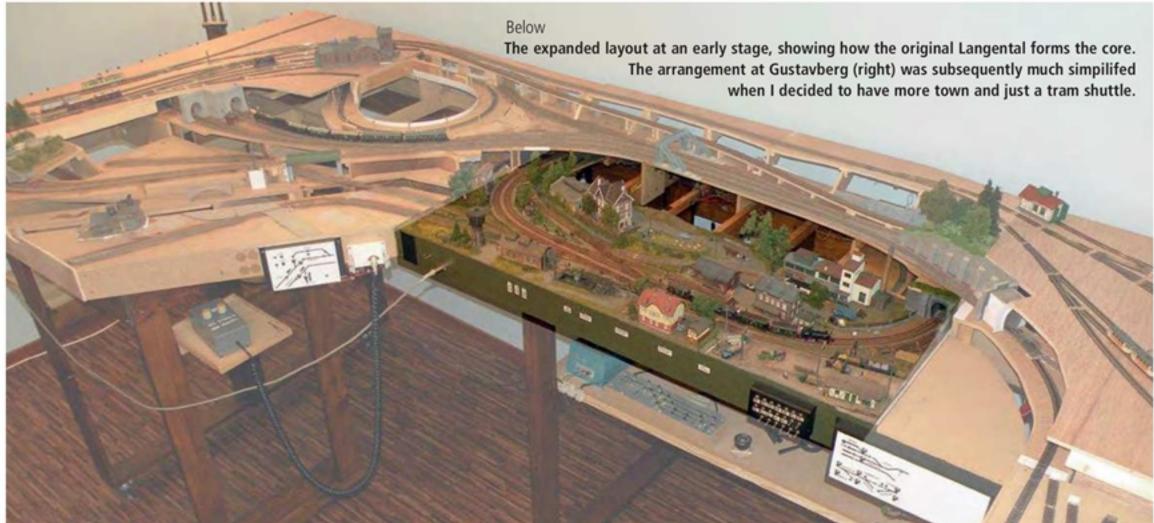


and below ground in many places does not exceed 50mm and is at most 70mm. This called for ingenious solutions. Many parts of the landscape are removable, and larger sections can be folded up using hinges, so the tracks that run underneath remain accessible at all times if a train should unexpectedly stop or become derailed. However, time has shown that those calamities rarely occur.

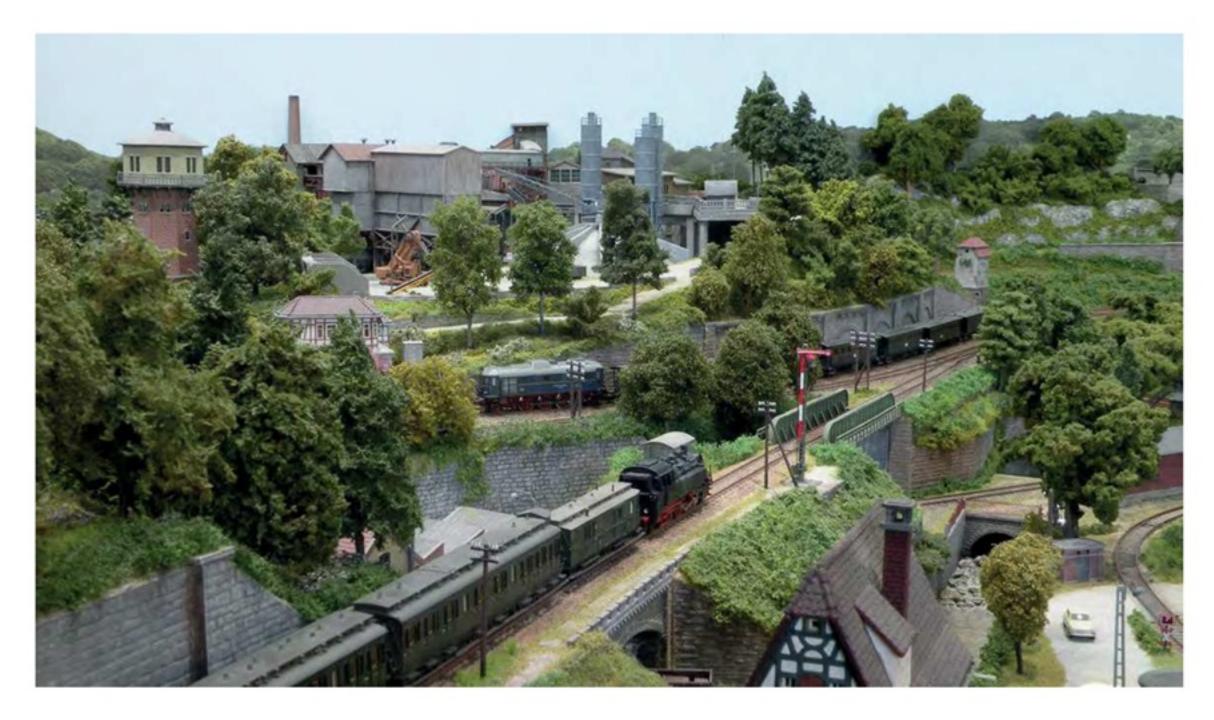
Adaptation of the old layout

Where the storage yard had been behind the original layout, open and easily accessible, during the expansion that area had to be covered with landscape. A double track main line now runs above the storage yard. As this is barely 50mm above the hidden tracks, these are difficult to access. But here too the need to intervene has been rare.

This main line is in fact also an oval with the central part compressed into a 'dog bone'. From this circuit there is another point, to Unterlenningen station. From Langental there is a connection to Unterlenningen via the main line. There is also a tram line from Unterlenningen to the highest section of the layout, on the right, with a tram stop at the romantic half-timbered walled town of Gustavberg. Finally, there is also a connection from the main

line to a former storage yard that has since been transformed into a fully-fledged extension with a new (visible) station. Here there is a backscene with space for a new storage yard behind it. However, this new project falls outside the scope of this report.

Scenery

The landscape was made with the 'classic' techniques that are used on most layouts. However, a few things are worth mentioning. First the greenery. Most of the trees come from my own 'cultivation': the wire braiding method alternated

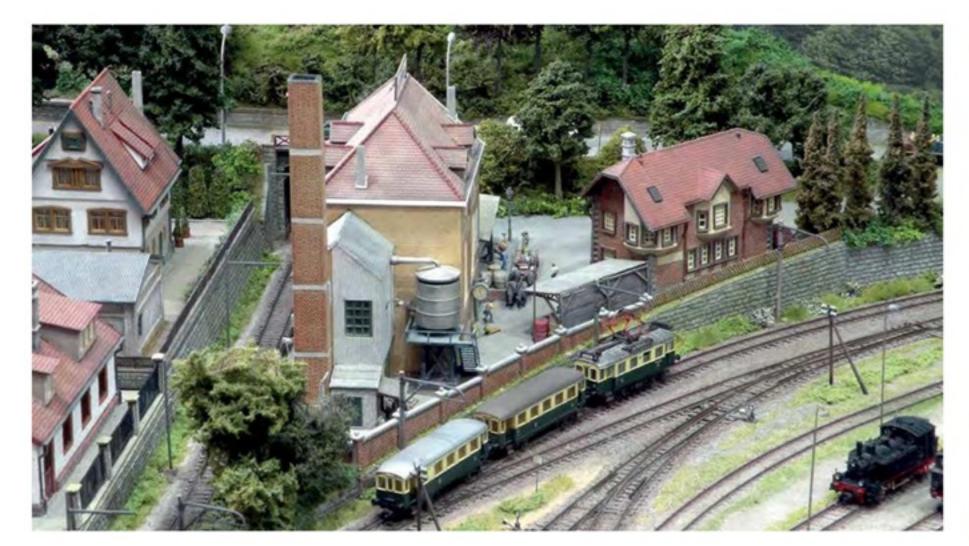

with the use of natural branches covered with commercial foliage material. For the rest, the landscape surface is covered with grass and shrub material from various manufacturers.

Structures

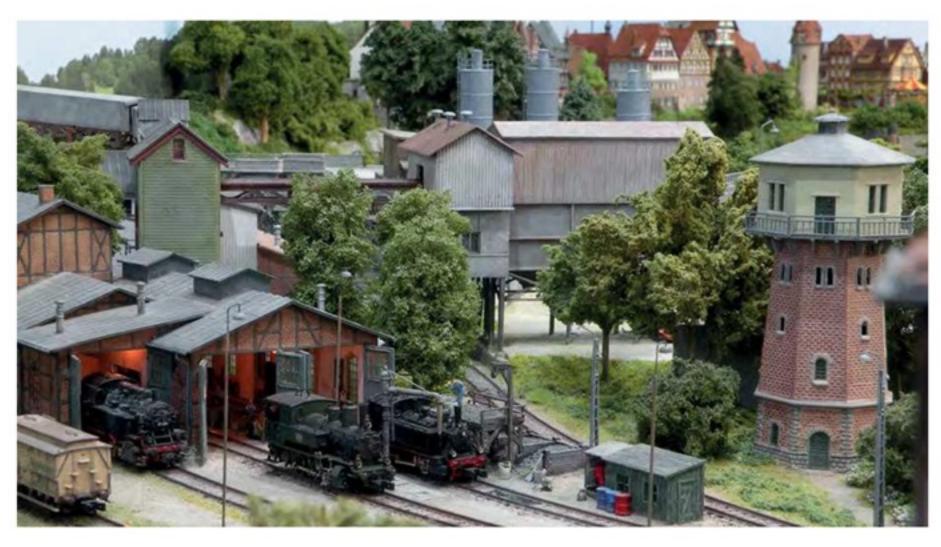
Most of the buildings are the products of different well-known brands. However, in many cases a lot of modification was done so that the origin can hardly be seen. A good example of this is the construction of the medieval wall of the town of Gustavberg. Here, the Kibri wall sections were combined in a completely different context than the

manufacturer's instructions suggest. This results in a unique creation from an existing kit.

The 'Scholl' brewery was completely scratchbuilt, with the addition of many details left over from other kits.

Finally, everything was naturally weathered which helps to personalise the buildings even more.

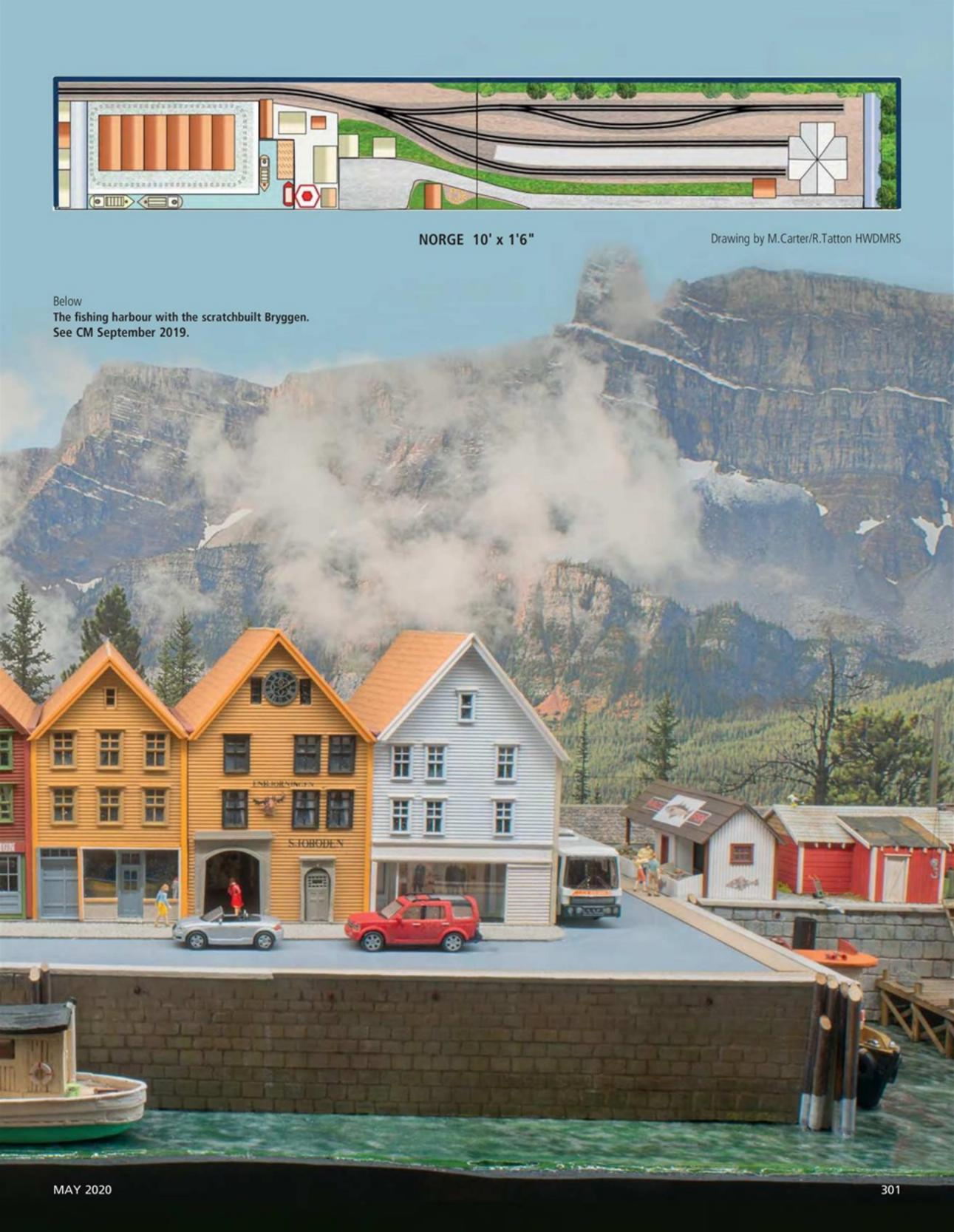
A taste of Norway

Inspiration

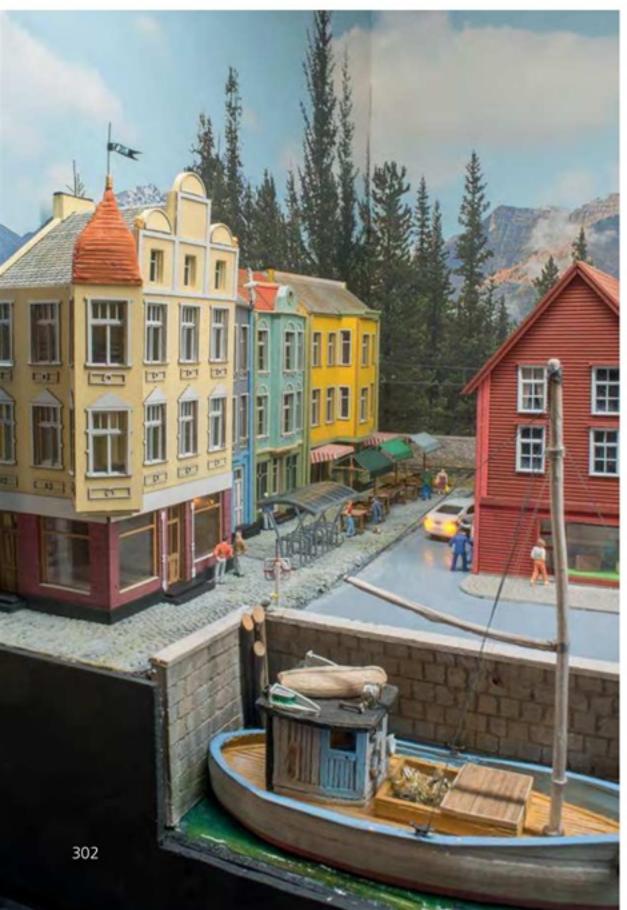
The story began in 2015 with a cruise visiting Norway and a ride on the awe-inspiring Flåmsbana railway. Flåm is a small village at the head of the Aurlandsfjord, one of most beautiful fjords in Norway. The line is one of the steepest railways in the world, with a climb of 2,838' in a matter of twelve

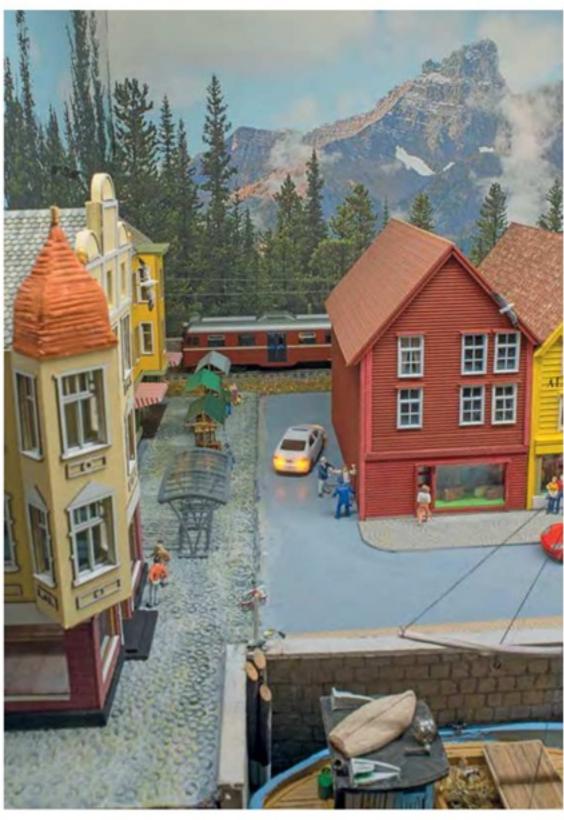
miles. The train takes about 45 minutes to climb gradients of 1 in 18 to a junction with the Bergen – Oslo main line at Myrdal. It travels through twenty or so tunnels that spiral through the mountains past lovely waterfalls and river valleys. A ride on the train is the most popular excursion at Flåm for cruise lines.

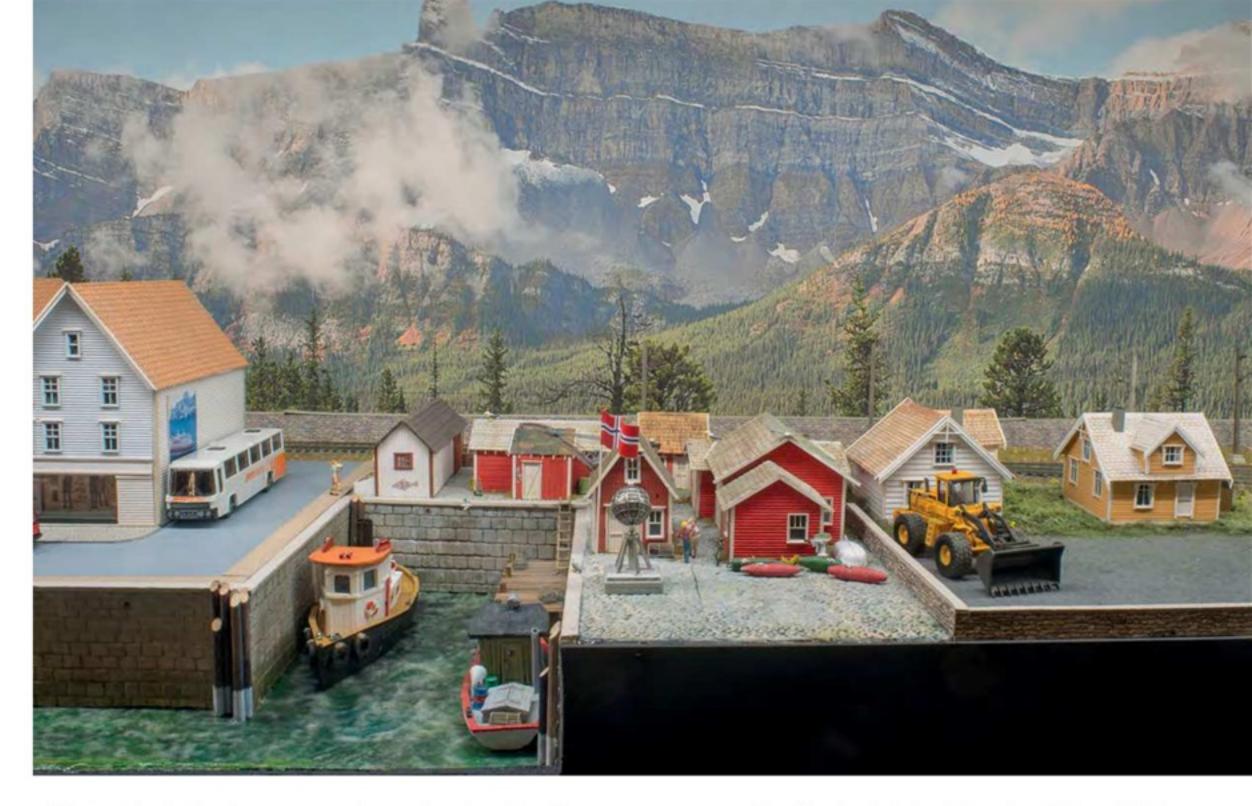












Unfortunately, by the time we arranged our cruise all space on the train was fully booked. Undeterred, I explored the website of Norwegian State Railways and found that I could book space to Voss on the main line – which included the Flåmsbana. So, we travelled on the tourist line to Myrdal where we caught a high speed BM73 to Voss. After lunch we then travelled back to Myrdal on a BM69a lokaltogsett before returning to Flåm. And all this cost less than the excursion offered by the cruise line!

The railway museum at Flam has a well-stocked souvenir shop and with some of the money I had saved I could not resist purchasing a model of one of the locos then pulling the train, an EL17.

On a second visit in 2016 I decided to try the NSB website again. This time I just booked the Flåmsbana train to Blomheller, a stop half-way up the mountain. My wife and I then walked back to Flåm alongside the railway, with the opportunity to photograph the trains as they passed. However, the green EL17s had now been replaced by silver EL18s, and this inevitably resulted in another purchase at the museum!

With a growing collection of Norwegian locos and rolling stock, I felt the need to build a layout. But what should I model? My purchases had left me with a very varied collection of stock.

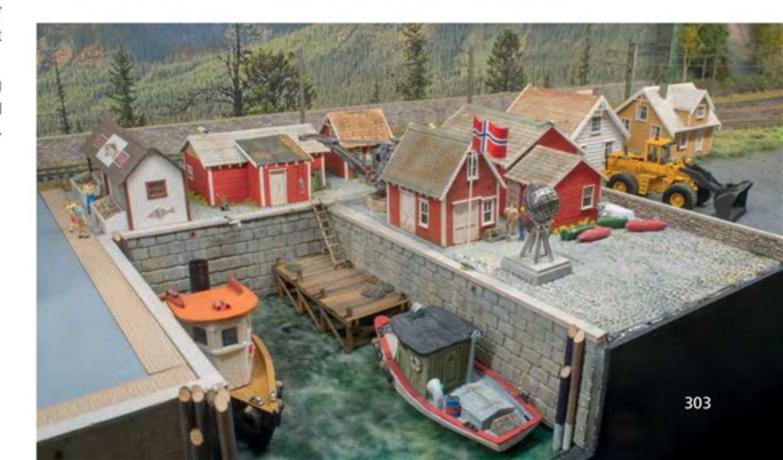

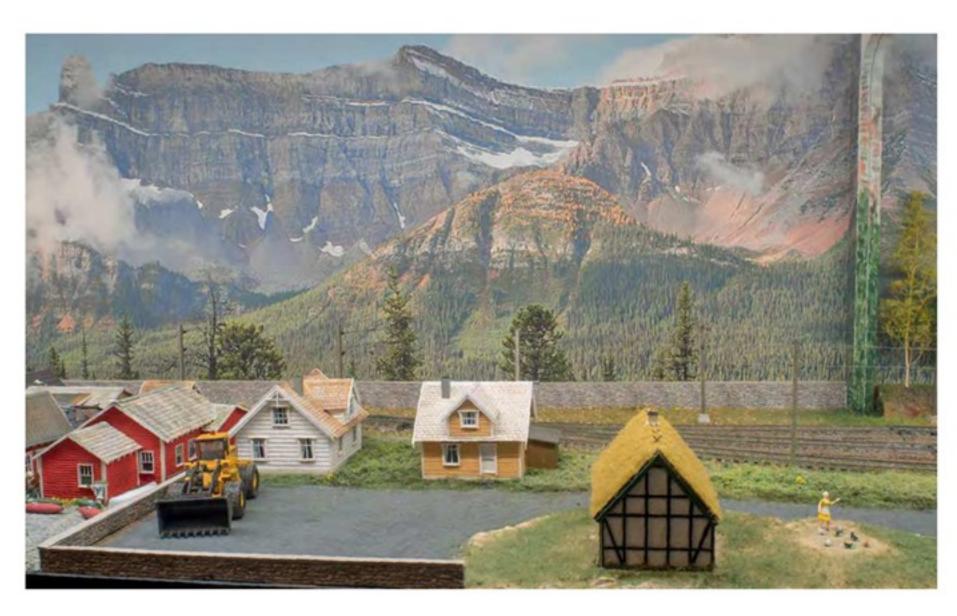
The small fishing village of typical Norwegian houses. The Flåm line had already been beautifully modelled by Hans Peters with his depiction of the intermediate station of Berekvam, where the north- and south-bound trains cross on what is otherwise a single line. (The layout was featured in the July 2016 issue of CM.) I saw the layout while showing my Red Hook Bay layout at the OntraXS! exhibition in Utrecht. In fact, Hans very kindly allowed my EL17 be a guest loco for a transition of the line.

Planning

Having been an exhibition manager, I am always mindful of the costs of visiting layouts. I have always tried to avoid hiring a van or building layouts that require several operators. My exhibition layouts, *Mill Falls*, *Red Hook Bay* (CM November 2014 and North American Special) and *Cheffley* (RM July 2019) are limited to what can be squeezed in the back of my wife's estate car, so something the size of the *Berekvam* layout would be a non-starter.

I decided early on that whatever I built would require a fiddle yard of at least 5' in order to accommodate trains of a reasonable length. I had bought a BM73 hi-speed train, which is a four-car unit 52" long. A reasonable (low-season) version of the Flåmsbana with three coaches top and tailed by two EL18s would be 50". Unfortunately running the six coaches that I had acquired would be a pipe dream as the fiddle yard would need to be a little under 8' long. Moreover, the train would overpower the scene with a station platform length of over 7'.

Baseboards

Twenty-five years ago, I built the benchwork for my home layout, the *Sierra Nevada* (CM June 2006). This has stood the test of time, but I would not pretend that my woodworking skills are of the highest order. For exhibition purposes base-boards need to be precise and as light as possible. Recently I have been using laser-cut self-assembly boards. For *Norge* I chose some full scenic baseboards manufactured by Tim Horn. I was really pleased how easy these were to assemble. Everything was precise and well-engineered.

Originally, I was going to use two 4' by 2' boards plus one 3' by 2' to form a scenic section of 11' by 2'. Unfortunately, I assumed the height of the boards was 18". Wrong! They are 2' tall and consequently did not fit into the car. A case of measure twice and order once. Having discovered my mistake, I then ordered two 5' by 18" boards. An expensive error that I hope not to repeat. Looking on the bright side, I have some boards ready assembled for another layout!

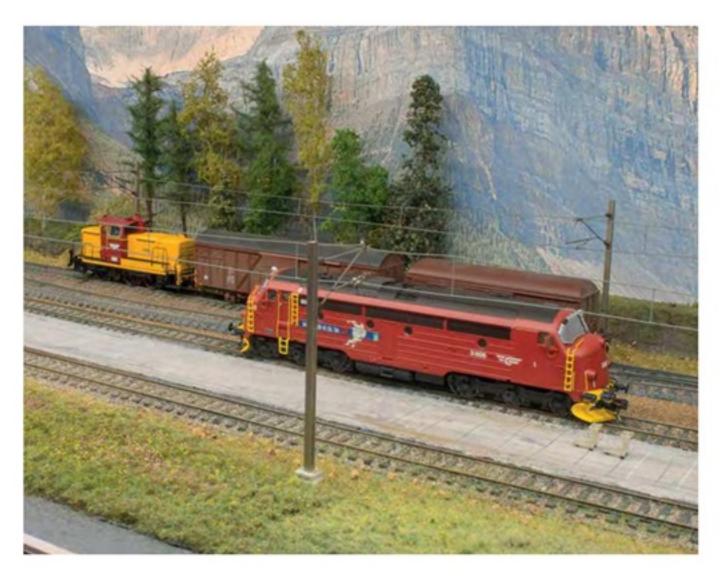
The boards are 6mm birch ply and come with countersunk pre-drilled holes, screws, and panel pins. By using a full scenic board with its self-contained top piece, I was able to use a strip of LEDs to light the layout.

The fiddle yard is a normal flat 5' by 2' board to allow access to the trains from both sides while exhibiting.

Track plan

The track plan is relatively simple and was determined by the structures and scenery that I wanted to feature on the layout.

The fiddle yard uses four medium radius Peco code 75 points to form five tracks of various lengths. The line enters the rear corner of the left-hand scenic board. A three-way point then separates the tracks with two servicing the station platform; the third track serves freight traffic and has a loop (using medium radius points) to allow a loco to run round.

Imaginative use of an old bookshelf

At first sight that may appear to be the case, but that does not stop us having fun and improving our skills even on a reasonable budget.

This article shows how I turned an old bookshelf into a Bern Lötschberg Simplon halt which I imagined had re-opened and was busy with traffic. I used readily available parts, and the cost for the basic layout was about £100.

I spent a bit on detailing the scene, in particular adding some good quality trees.

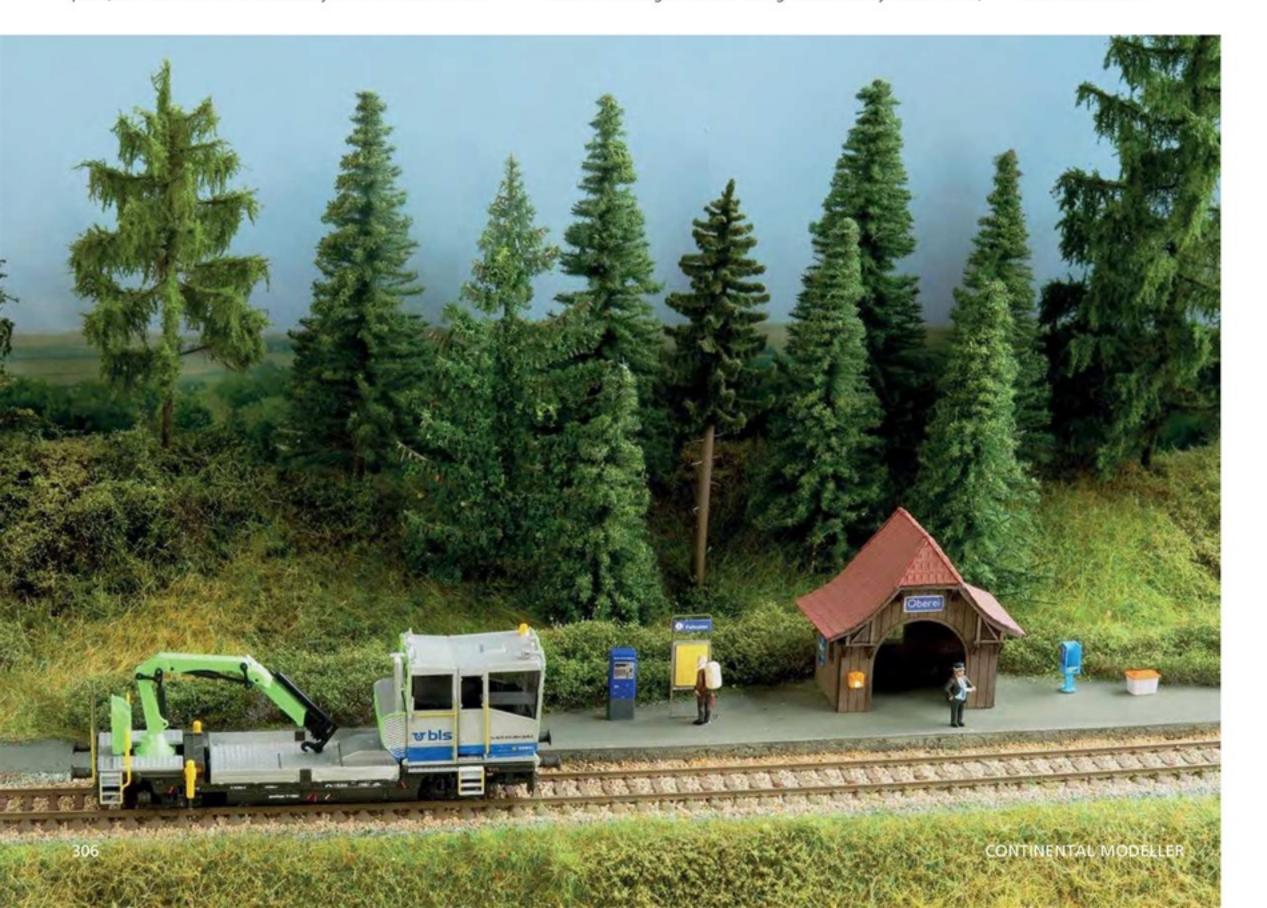
The track is Peco Code 75 flexible with steel sleepers, raised off the bookshelf on Woodland Scenics 'Sub Terrain System' risers.

The landscape was made from Woodland Scenics 'Shaper Sheet' covered in scatter material, foliage, and static grass, with the undergrowth and foliage materials by Anita Décor, Above

Busch, Heki, Noch, and Silhouette. The trees are by Heki and Noch, with some more elaborate ones by MBR.

I used a Faller laser-cut building (ref.110084) that looked similar to the one on the old BLS branch line at Ei and Oberei.

The accessories on the platform (including grit bins, timetable board, ticket machine, etc.) are by Swiss Model Rail, with figures by Noch and Preiser.

Catenary is by Sommerfeldt, four masts and three lengths of wire.

The rolling stock available includes a BLS GTW2/6 railcar (Piko), BLS Tm235 tractor (Kibri), SBB Cargo Eem922 tractor (HAG), SBB RBe4/4 railcar (Lima), and various wagons (Roco).

The scene took me around a month to build, working at the rate of just one or two hours a day.

I am very pleased with my little model of Oberei halt. It was fun to build and gave me somewhere to put the station accessories that I had been accumulating over the years when visiting the *Plattform der Kleinserie* event in Bauma.

Making the platform shelter

Laser-cut card is one of the newer materials now available for modellers. It is used for buildings, fencing, bridges, windows and doors, and even plants and vegetables. It can be delicate but also very strong.

Aku, Busch, Joswood, Faller, Fides, Laser Creation, Noch, Peco, Swiss Model Rail, and Tip Top Modell are just some of the companies producing kits using laser-cut card, some of which might be useful for Swiss layouts.

This kit is one of the smaller ones by Faller with parts made from card, thin timber, and clear plastic (for the windows). The instructions are mainly pictorial and I found them very easy to follow. The laser-cut card and timber parts are held into the backing sheets by small 'tags' which need to be carefully cut through with a sharp blade before assembly can begin.

After I had finished the kit, I added a station sign that I made on my computer.

It took me about two hours to make this kit, excluding the drying time of the adhesives and paint.

I think this is would be a good first laser-cut kit for the novice – it is easy to assemble, and it looks realistic.

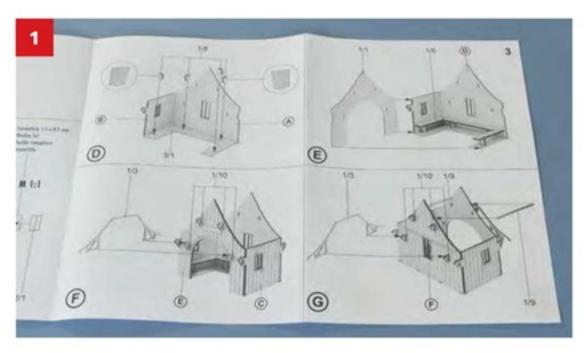

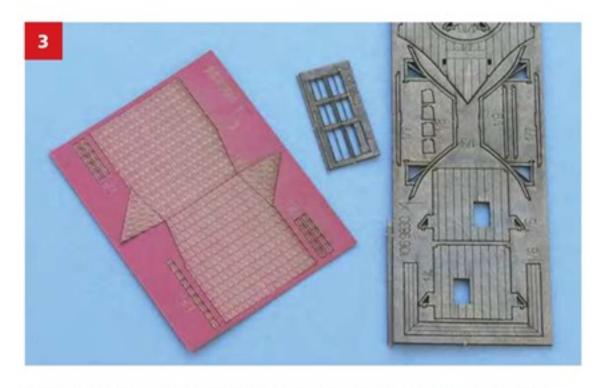


Tools and materials

Sharp craft knife
Resealable cutting board
Steel ruler
UHU Holz Leim adhesive
Small paint brushes for applying the adhesive and paint

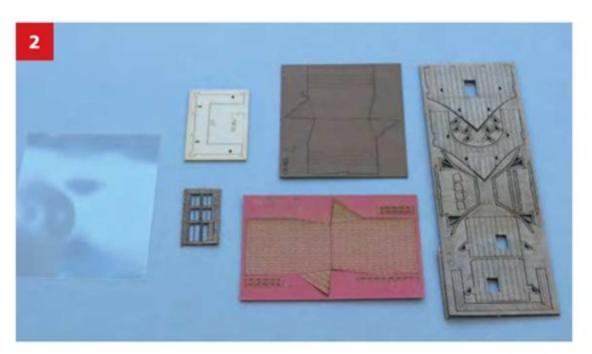

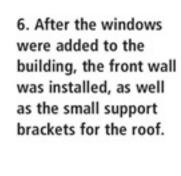

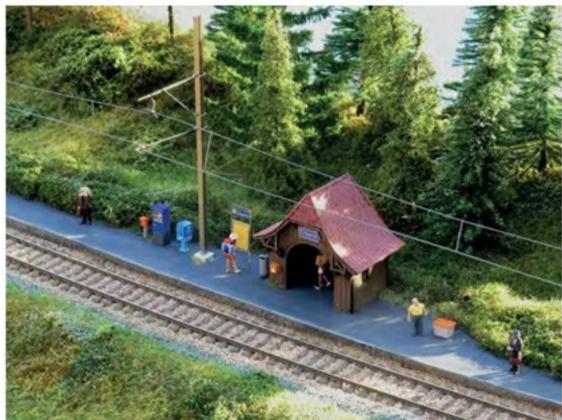

What lack of space?

The model builder and painter Michiel Stolp is highly regarded among Gauge 1 modellers for his weathering service under the name of Becasse. After building various layouts and dioramas for different clients, private and commercial, including KM1, Michiel wanted to build something with which he could participate in an exhibition in his own right. The result is *Vierheim Industrie*, a siding serving the Elektro Keramische Werke in Vierheim. It is set in Epoch IV, and diesel worked.

It represents a characteristic factory environment which you can, or could, encounter almost anywhere in the world. The entire layout with fiddle yard is now only 7.9m long and 60cm wide. Most modellers would say that was too little space for a decent HO layout, and much too small for O, never mind Gauge 1. But Michiel Stolp thinks differently: "less is often more". In The Netherlands there is a saying: "Within the limitations, you recognise the master."

Granted that for Gauge 1 the available space is not much, and that is precisely the intention. Michiel wanted to show what is possible and that you really do not have to have a huge space if you choose the 'royal gauge', as the Germans call Gauge 1.

The track plan is very simple; there were originally only two turnouts and two sidings serving the buildings of the EKV (Elektro Keramische Werke, Vierheim).

One of the restrictions is the absence of a run-round facility. An incoming DB loco with a few wagons is trapped at the end of the track. This obliged the EKV to purchase a small shunter to release arriving locos. This makes it plausible that there would be two locos active at this small yard, leaving aside, of course, that in reality it would be an expensive solution to have an extra loco available, complete with a workshop, for delivering and collecting just a few wagons each week.

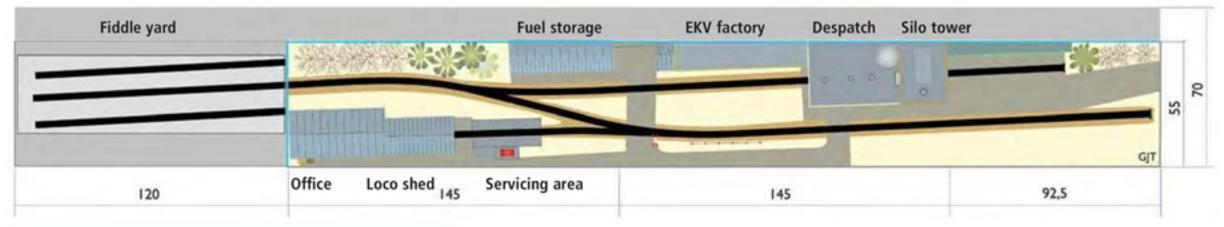

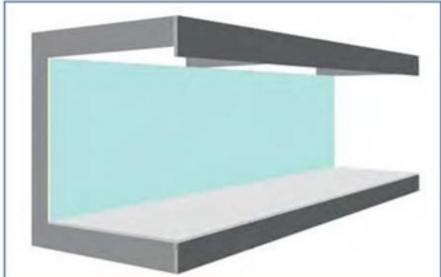

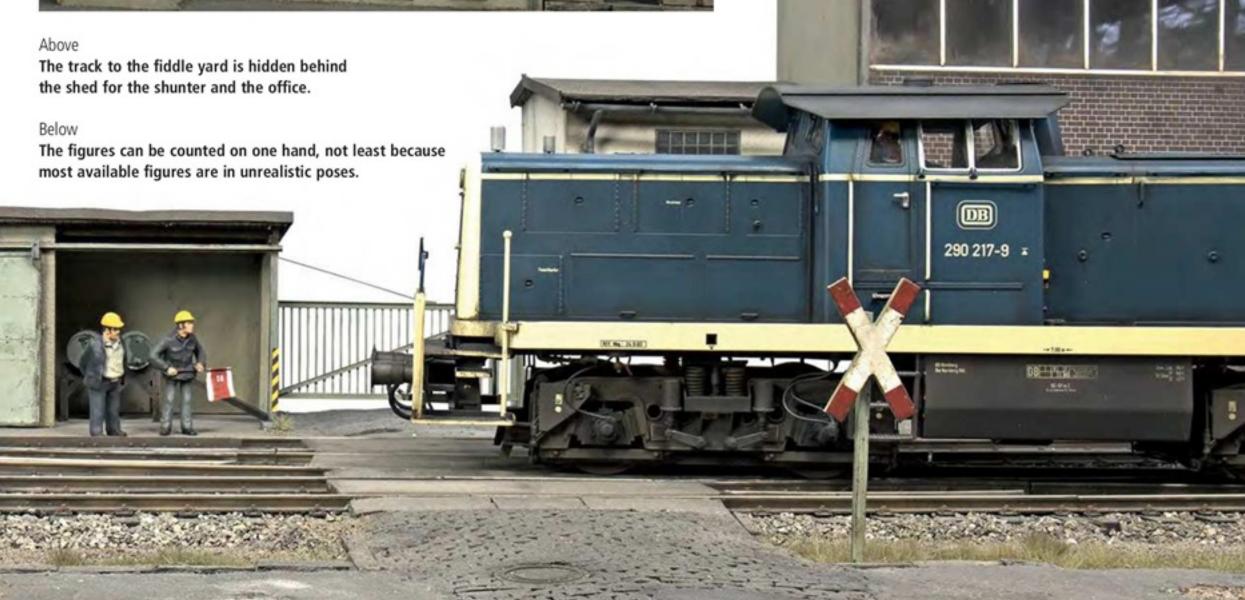
Besides the locomotives, there are of course also suitable wagons for the supply of raw materials – lime, soda, and other bulk powders; these come in silos and self-unloading hoppers with a swinging roof. Fuel and packaging materials are also delivered by rail, in tank wagons and vans. Vans are also used for taking away the finished the ceramic isolators, fuses, and parts for switches. The most important customers for these are Siemens and Bosch.

Baseboard

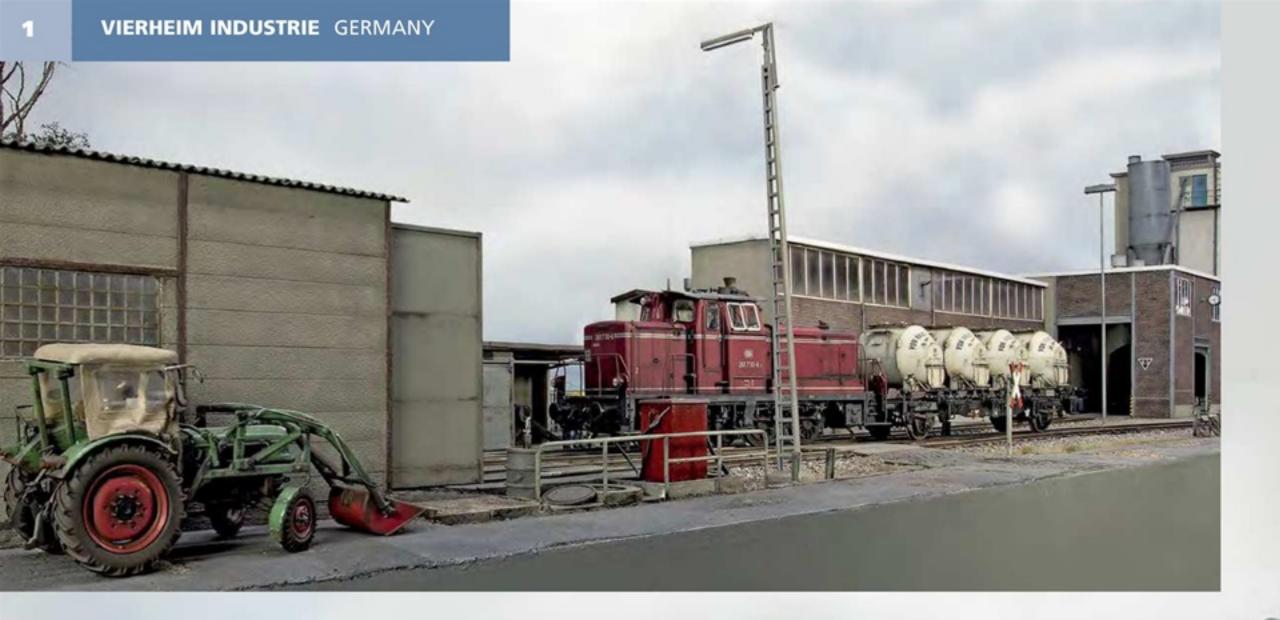
The layout is made up of separate sections, based on the module system by Modellbau Atelier Ernst Jorissen. The segments can best be described as a large square C where the base, background, and sky with valance form a whole. These segments rest on a sturdy but flexible substructure that can easily be expanded if parts are added to the diorama.

The connected fiddle yard is a sliding plate simply moved by hand and has three tracks each 1.2m long.









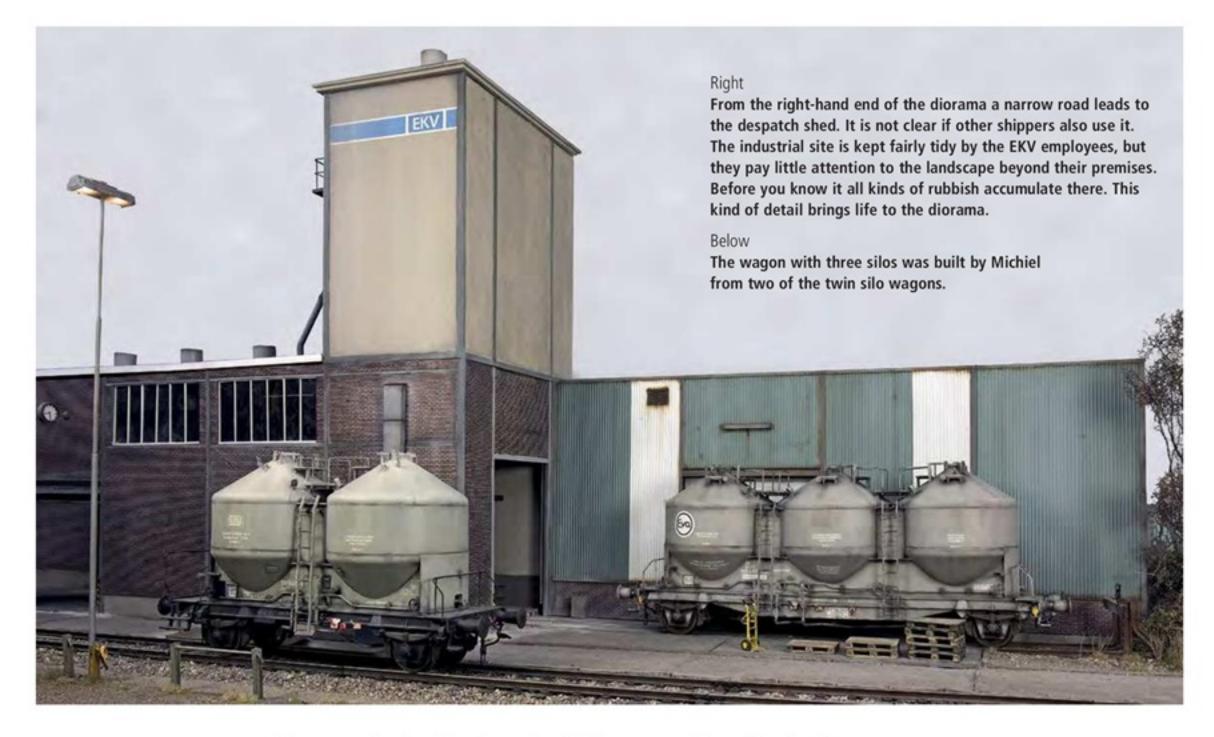


Michiel likes agricultural vehicles, and there is plenty of choice in 1:32. This classic has had the full weathering treatment.

Being true to the period requires following the prototype consistently and sometimes involves small nuances. The V60 in red most commonly had yellow lining, but a large number of the BR261s had grey. Also, to give the right impression it is important that the wagons are suitable for the industry represented. For the supply of raw materials such as quartz sand, a self-unloading hopper with a swing roof is the appropriate vehicle. The four release flaps have been opened and secured. The shunters' steps, grab handles, and brake lines were also modified. The wagon was then completely repainted and provided with new inscriptions, and was suitably weathered.

Unloading raw materials and loading finished products takes place to a large extent within the factory. The opened door gives us a glimpse into the despatch department; the roller shutter can be opened and closed by a Faulhaber motor controlled through a locomotive decoder. The door also makes the building look less massive.

Moreover, such a simple background works from every angle of view, something that can never be achieved with two-dimensionally painted building façades or mountains.

Trees

Making the bare trees was a different story. Since realistic bare trees are not commercially available in 1:32, it was necessary to scratchbuild. And as you will know, the finer the branches, the more work. The poplar stems were made up of brass tube, from 3mm to 1mm, with branches of twisted 0.4mm nickel-silver wire. A mixture of fine sawdust, paint, and glue was applied to this. Pieces of sea moss, some leaves from Polak, and a mist of olive green paint from an airbrush gave the desired result.

Conclusion

The nice thing about this layout is that you can play endlessly with just two points and a traverser without getting bored – it is total theatre with movement, sound, a bit of smoke, and animation, where you are right in the middle, because everything takes place at a height of 1.3m, more or less at eye level.

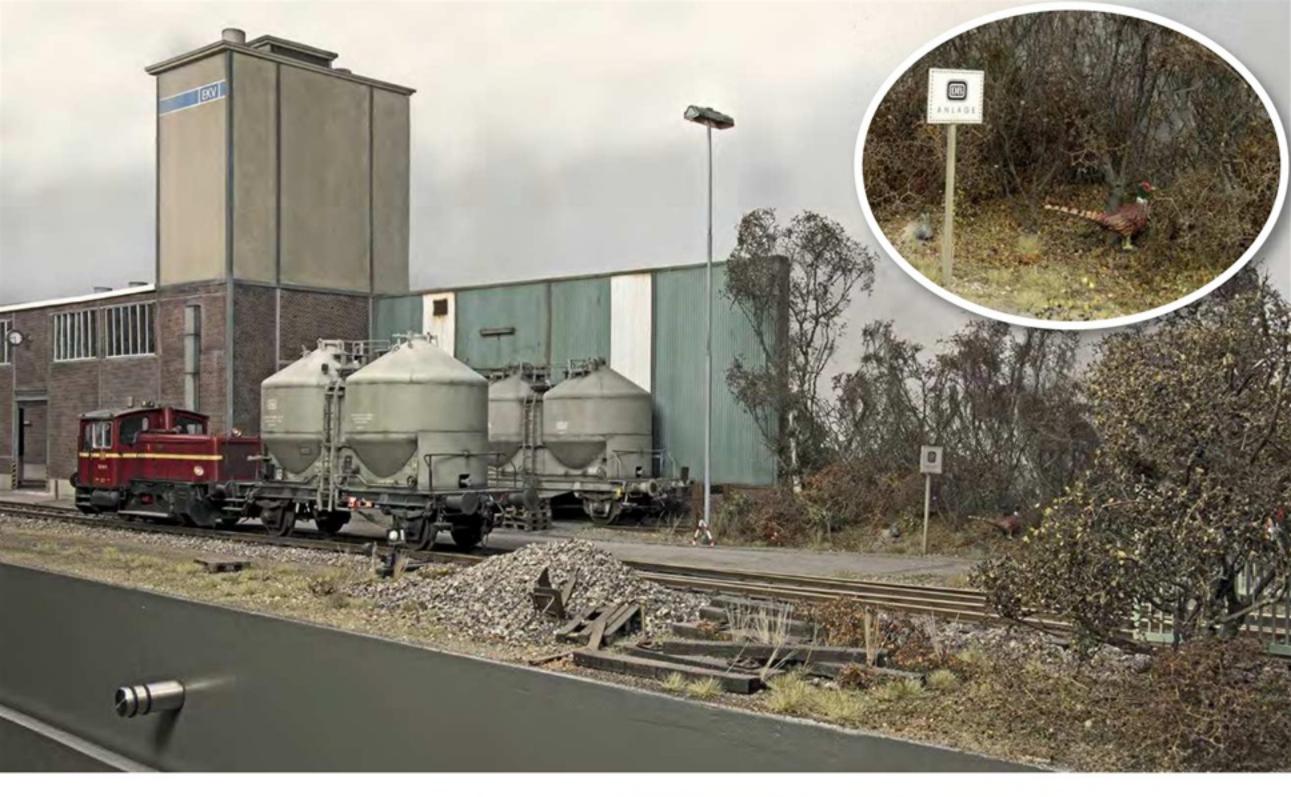

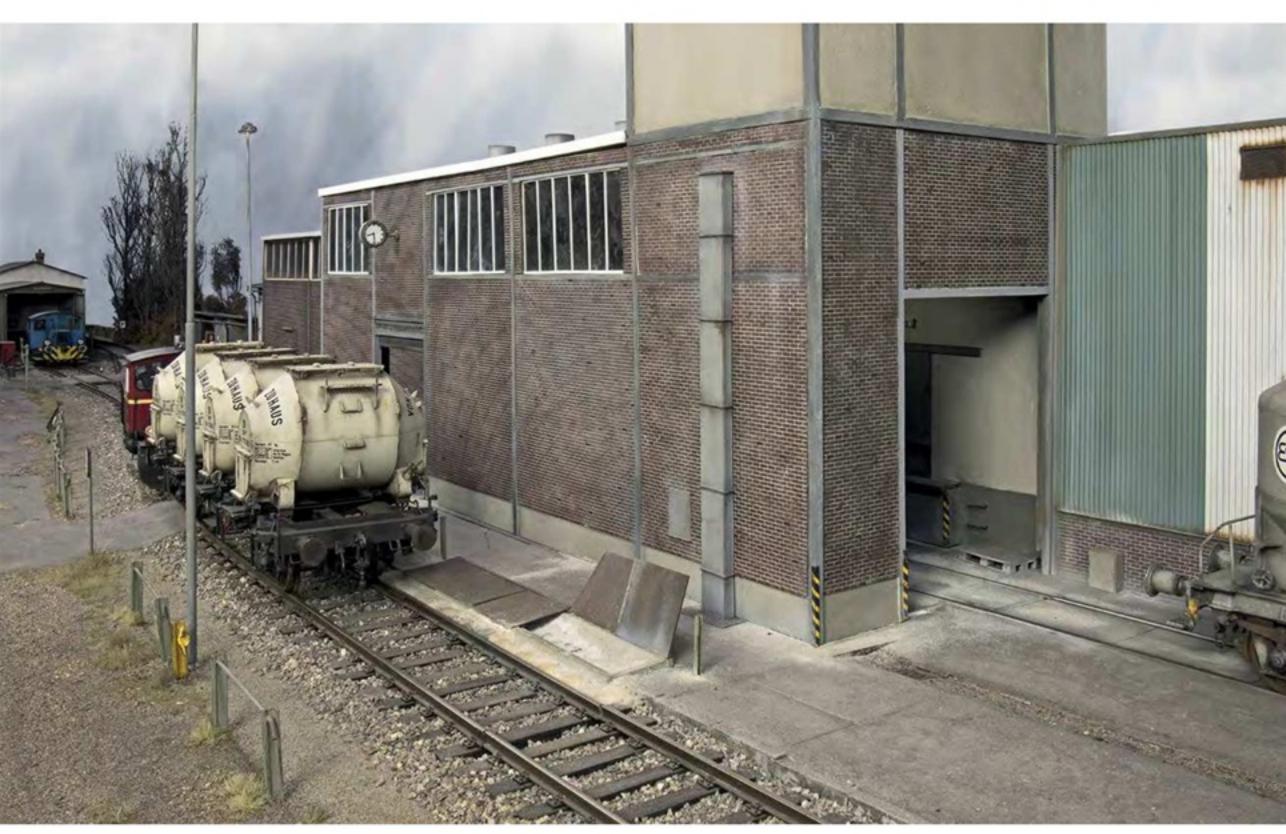

Austria in the 1970s

Excursions in search of vanishing steam

In the mid-1970s the elimination of steam in Austria had not been completed and there was quite a lot still to be seen on both standard and narrow gauges. Besides this there was steam on private lines such as the Achenseebahn and the Graz Koflacher Bahn (GKB), and, as a bonus, steam from behind the Iron Curtain could be seen at a number of places. I was able to make two visits, one in 1974 and another in 1975.

I was working in North Africa at the time, so I flew to Rome and caught a train from Roma Termini leaving at 22.15 to Venice where a change was made to the 07.10 to Graz and Vienna, arriving Graz at 16.12. As this was ÖBB (Austrian Federal Railways) the arrival was on time, which was very important as the 16.30 GKB departure to Lieboch was one of the few loco-worked passenger trains on the GKB using its class 50 2-10-0, most of the others being railcars.

The GKB is owned by a mining company and had begun to dieselise by this time, but I only remember seeing steam on the goods workings. It had a very interesting collection of locos, the oldest, built in 1860, being 0-6-0 No.671 which was reputedly still used occasionally but I was not lucky enough to see it working. Other locos included eleven Gölsdorf class 56 2-8-0s and a number of former ÖBB class 152 2-10-0s. (As late as the mid-1980s I saw a GKB freight double headed by a diesel and a class 56.)

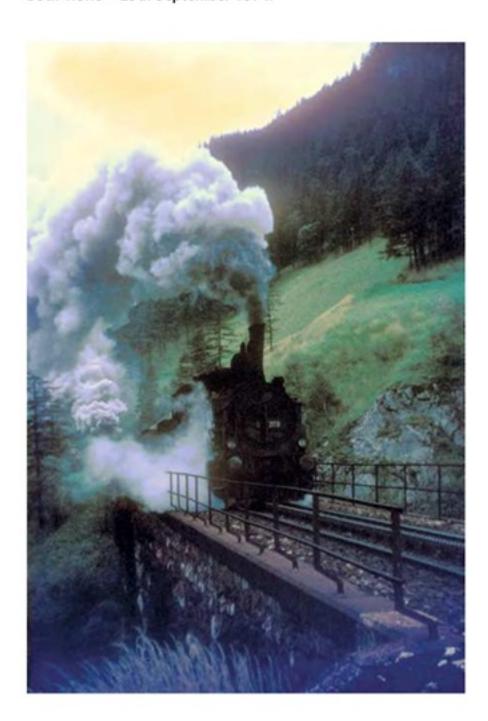

The next stop was the Erzbergbahn, the standard gauge rack fitted line built to carry iron ore from the Eisenerz mountain to a steelworks at Donawitz. Empties were worked upgrade by rack tanks. The original class 97 0-6-2Ts dating from 1890 were still in use although some diesels had also been introduced. Three class 197 0-12-0Ts and one class 297 2-12-2T were built later, but I only saw the 97s working. They did provide some very impressive smoke and steam effects. There were three daily passenger workings up the mountain, consisting of two coaches and a parcels van propelled by a class 97, and a more frequent service between Vordernberg and Vordernberg Markt worked by diesel rail-cars. Most visiting enthusiasts stayed at the Gasthof Gruber in Vordernberg.

Then it was via Vienna to Gmund, with a stop at Schwarzenau to see the class 93 worked branches to Martinsberg and Fratres.

The branch to Fratres was interesting as it stopped only a few feet beyond the hut which acted as a passenger shelter with just a sleeper across the track and a warning disc. There was no run-round loop and the train was then pushed back towards the junction. The reason for this peculiar arrangement was that the line had continued further when built but following the loss of territory after the First World War the new Czech border forced the line to stop at Fratres.

At Gmund there was another cross-border working, this time from Czechoslovakia, where a very smart 556 class 2-10-0 worked a short passenger train over three times a day, with a number of goods workings as well.

The most interesting thing at Gmund were the 760mm lines, to Gross Gerungs and to Litschau and Heidenreichstein, worked by class 399 (Mh) 0-8+4 Engerths and class 298 (U) 0-6-2Ts, although the class 2095 B-B diesels had already made an appearance.

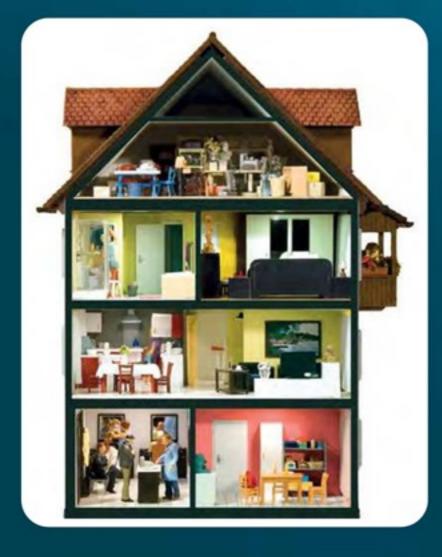
In 1986 I was lucky enough to be transferred to work for two years in Austria, by which time standard gauge steam had finished though I was able to spend most weekends on one or other of the narrow gauge lines. But that is another story ...

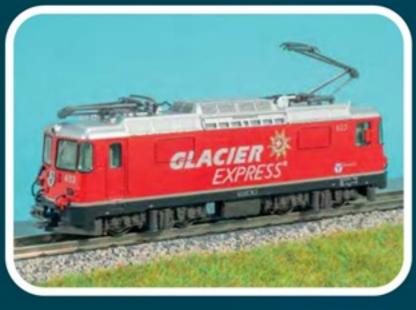

Minitrix

New items in N again have their own 68 page A4 size landscape format brochure.

There are several special limited editions to mark thirty years of the Märklin Retailer Initiative (MHI).

The 'my hobby' programme of value models is extended with several new items.

Delivery dates are not given.

Most new locomotives now come with a factory-fitted DCC sound decoder; this will run by default on analogue DC.

Epoch I

To mark 175 years of railways in Württemberg, the G12 2-10-0 for the first time in Länderbahn livery in the Minitrix range.

To accompany – a set of five different four-wheel wagons: van with raised brake house, van, beer van with raised brake house, steel open, and tank wagon with brake house.

Epoch III

MHI 30 limited edition – Insider Club model of the year: BR01 Pacific as rebuilt by the DB in 1959 with a new boiler, with small Witte smoke deflectors. The model has a DCC sound decoder, and working cab and running gear lights. Orders had to be placed by the end of February.

DB BR186 in 1957 condition, with DCC sound decoder. The model also features a processor controlled flickering firebox.

MHI 30 limited edition – VT98 four-wheel railcar and VS98 driving trailer, with DCC sound decoder; the powered unit can be run individually. The VB98 intermediate trailer will be sold separately.

New tooling – DB V169 B-B diesel hydraulic with auxiliary gas turbine, the first time it has been modelled in N. The model will have a DCC sound decoder, and lighting by warm-white LEDs (including the cabs).

Express coaches, with LED interior lighting: A4üm-63 first in blue, B4üm-63 second and BD4üm-61 second baggage in green, WR4üm-64 'DSG' restaurant (with skirt) in red, and Post 4mg-al/26 post van (with skirt) in green.

New tooling – DB centre entrance bogie Umbauwagen, rebuilds using standard components on older underframes, more or less modified. They are offered as a set of AByg composite and BDyg second baggage, plus a Byg second. All come with LED interior lighting.

The Museum wagon for the year, only available from the Märklineum in Göppingen, is a DB type G07 sixwheel van with raised brake house decorated for the 'Lebkuchen Schmidt' company of Nürnberg.

Epoch IV

Modified tooling – DR BR03¹⁰ reko Pacific, with replacement boiler, mixing feedwater heater, and oil firing. The model has a DCC sound decoder and working lights, including in the cab and over the running gear.

Fleischmann

The new items brochure is A4 size landscape format, 108 pages. It gives expected delivery quarter but not recommended prices. Information is by simple symbol panels (user, epoch, length, couplings, lights, minimum radius, digital status), with extra remarks for just a few models.

Some projects are illustrated with prototype pictures and some with retouched photos of HO models.

A factory-fitted digital decoder is now an option for many models, often with sound, except the smaller steam locos.

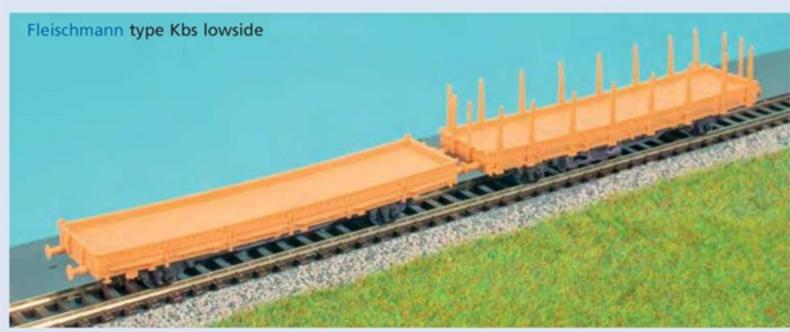

There will also be two special limited editions: Lang Recycling No.507 and TSO (France) CAT 3406. The models will have a metal body and frame and be driven by a coreless motor; they will only be available with a factory-fitted ESU Lok Pilot Micro DCC decoder - one of the functions is remote uncoupling of standard couplers. A working prototype was shown to demonstrate the coupling. The model will also run on analogue DC supplies.

There is further new tooling in the form of the DB BR628.0 twin unit diesel railcars, with corrugated sides, dating from 1974. Body shells were shown. Both conventional buffer beam and Scharfenberg coupler variants are planned, both in blue/beige.

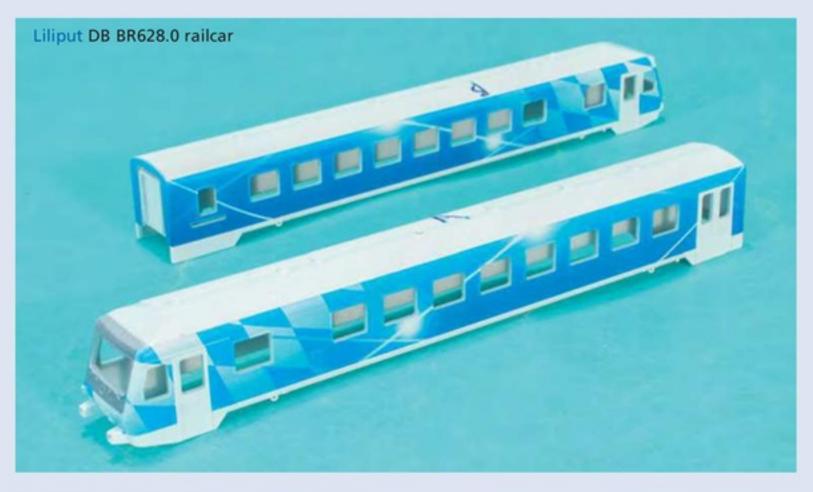

Now due at the end of the year is the Bodensee-Toggenburg Be4/4 electric dating from 1929; eight almost identical machines were supplied to the Emmental-Burgdorf-Thun and two to the Solothurn-Münster-Bahn. Eight models are envisaged: BT green c.1931, BT green c.1965; BT preserved, in brown, c.1989; BT 'historic' green c.1994; BT green as on the DVZO museum line, c.2002; EBT green c.1963; EBT 'historic' green c.1997; and SMB green c.1966.

New to the list: Paris - Lyon - Méditerranée 2D1+1D2 experimental diesel pairs (later SNCF 262) AD1 and BD1, ordered in 1935 with 12-cylinder Sulzer engines, designed to haul passenger trains of 600 tonnes at 130km/h between Paris and Menton.

The TT range is described in an 88-page catalogue, just shorter than A4. Type Zas bogie tank wagon with brake platform in 'GATX' red (Q4).

Jugoslavia

Epoch III – type Gdvg four-wheel van (Q2).

An Italian peaked roof four-wheel van as JZ type Gdov (Q3).

Slovenia

Epoch V – type Posti bogie post van (Q4).

Greece

Epoch IV – type Eaos-v bogie open with OSE markings (Q2).

Piko

There is no separate new items leaflet for TT, but new items are noted in the 40 page A4 size landscape format full catalogue. The introduction notes that it is now fifteen years since Piko started making TT models.

New DR version of the type Lgs⁵⁷⁹ four-wheel flat carrying a 'Simson' 20' container (Q3).

Epoch V – new tooling: BR150 Co-Co electric, initially in DBAG traffic red (Q2). An unpainted sample was shown.

Epoch VI – new version of the Taurus Bo-Bo electric in 'FlixTrain' green (Q1).

New version of the DB BR294 diesel hydraulic in orient red (Q3).

New version of the BR442 Talent 2 three car electric set in DB Regio traffic red (Q4).

Epoch IV – new version of the Russian-built TGK2 fourwheel diesel shunter in orange as T203 (Q4).

Two new Epoch IV versions of the DR BR251 Co-Co electric from the Rübeland line, in green with red frames and in red with a thin white stripe (both Q2). (In price list, but not catalogue.)

Modified tooling – Kö II with open cab, in black with either Epoch II DRG or Epoch III DR markings, and in red with DB Epoch III markings. There will also be a closed cab variant in DR Epoch IV orange. (All Q4.)

New tooling – a range of DR four- and six-axle reko coaches, expected in the middle of the year according to the flyer but third quarter on price list. They will have prototypical roof shape with weld ribs and vents, flush glazing, tail light lenses, and multi-coloured interiors. The Post van is loaded with post containers. The baggage van has curtains in the guard's compartment. Underframe detailed with added parts. Equipped with close couplers in NEM pockets.

As a set of four six-wheelers, one baggage and three seconds; and a set of three four-wheel seconds plus a six-wheel Post van. Both sets in either Epoch III dark green with one thin white stripe or Epoch IV without lining.

Epoch IV – set of three representing a service train: four-wheel second, six-wheel second, and six-wheel baggage, the six-wheelers with markings indicating the carriage of propane gas.

Epoch V – six-wheel baggage classified Dag⁸⁵³ in green with DBAG logo.



Kühn

The 100-page brochure between A5 and A4 size covers TT, N, and electronics. TT occupies about 75%.

A further version of the BR94⁵ (Prussian T16¹) 0-10-0T, DR Epoch IV, coal fired, with angled extended bunker, and with Riggenbach counter-pressure brakes.

New versions of the BR111 Bo-Bo electric in Epoch IV blue-beige with either scissors or single arm pantographs (the former a limited edition), and in Epoch V traffic red with single arm pantographs, also as a limited edition.



New version of the Czech class 749 (formerly T478.1) Bo-Bo diesel in CD Epoch V red & yellow.

More Epoch V versions of the RS1 diesel railcar, as VT302 and 308 of the Elster-Saale-Bahn (Erfurter Bahn GmbH) in green & white and as VT650 083 of the Ostdeutsche Eisenbahn GmbH (ODEG) in yellow & white, and as a CD 'Regio Spider' class 840 and class 841 in Epoch V blue & white, the latter as a limited edition.



New tooling – Czech class 753.6 Bo-Bo diesel, nicknamed 'Bizon', as rebuilt from T478.3 by CZ Loko with an efficient and environmentally friendly Caterpillar engine, in CD Cargo blue & grey and Rail Cargo Carrier red & grey.

Still under development – new model of the class 810 (ex-M152.0) four-wheel diesel railcar and matching trailer in CD Epoch V red & white and blue & white 'Najbrt' liveries; body shells and chassis castings were shown.

All these loco models have a plastic injection moulded body, a five-pole motor, with two dynamically balanced flywheels, all axles driven, two wheels with







traction tyres, pickup from all wheels, working directionally controlled white head and red tail lights, a NEM 651 six-pole inline socket for a decoder, and NEM coupler pockets on close-coupling mounts.

New tooling – second/third composite and third class middle entrance bogie coaches built for the Heidenau – Altenberg line following its conversion from narrow to standard gauge but subsequently dispersed. The two types are different lengths and this has been correctly modelled. Unpainted samples were seen. They will be sold in sets of three reflecting the typical train formation (one composite and two seconds) initially in DR green and CSD red-brown (both Epoch III).

More new tooling – a six-wheel Post van joins the range of *reko* four- and six wheelers. It will be available paired with a four-wheel second in Epoch III and Epoch IV versions, the latter either with or without lining. The coaches will come in similarly decorated sets of four (pre series six-wheeler with four doors, six-wheeler, four-wheeler, and baggage).



Two new Epoch IV versions of the Uerdingen 63m³ bogie tank wagon built from 1940, 'Schwedt' and 'Total' (the latter in a twin pack), with brake platform.

New tooling – the Uerdingen tank with the original brake house, for Epoch III, in plain DR grey or lettered for 'Chemische Werk Buna'.

New Epoch V versions of the type Shimmns sliding tarpaulin short bogie bulkhead flat in twin packs, as operated by GATX, Duro Djakovic, LogServ, and Captrain – the latter has elaborate graphics aimed at recruiting loco drivers.

Igra Model the structure specialist from the Czech Republic has some rolling stock in HO and TT. New in TT – type Bai second class coach in CSD Epoch IV green, three numbers, all based in Praha. (Q1)

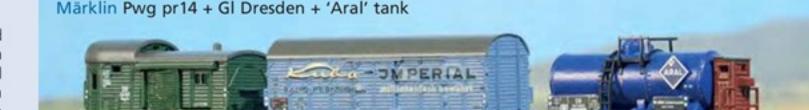

Lenz

The O gauge range continues to be developed, though a few unforeseen technical issues have delayed some

The information was again conveyed in a large format (more than A3) newspaper-style broadsheet.

The major new project was the BR44 'Jumbo' three-cylinder 2-10-0 as a mainly metal model to be produced in collaboration with Kiss; existing Kiss models were used as illustrations. A range of DRG, DR, and DB variants were proposed across Epochs II and III, with sundry detail differences as appropriate, such as large or small smoke deflectors, with or without front skirts, coal or oil firing, all with the (most common) 2'2'T34 tender. The models would naturally have all the hightech digital features expected of Lenz (lights, sound, optional smoke, remote controlled couplings, etc.).

However, not long after the Fair – but after the main German magazines had gone to press with reports from the event - came the surprise announcement that project would not proceed, apparently because the same prototype had also been proposed by other manufacturers.

The next anticipated loco deliveries are:

BR38 4-6-0 (former Prussian P8), initially as DRG Epoch II, DB Epoch III with either box or tub tender, and DR Epoch III.

BR55 (Prussian G8.1) 0-8-0, DB and DR Epoch III versions.

BR562 (Prussian G8.2) 2-8-0, DB and DR Epoch III versions.

The Wyhlen 10t rail mounted crane announced three years ago is making progress, but slowly: a sample was shown.

Work continues on the Group 29 all-steel express bogie coaches - A4üe-28 first, two B4üe-28 seconds, and Pw4üe-28 baggage van - built from 1928 to 1931. In contrast to their predecessors, the so-called 'Pike' coaches with tapered ends, these had straight sides and recessed entrances. They ran on Görlitz II heavy bogies. The models will have all the Lenz-typical features, including full interior, constant interior lighting (switchable in digital mode), sprung buffers, and dark nickel-plated wheels.

Also still under way is the Deutsche Bundesbahn E41 Bo-Bo electric, the first electric in the Lenz O range.

Lenz Wyhlen 10t crane







This completely new development benefits from the experience gained in the construction of previous models. It will have remote control of pantographs, a driver changing with the direction of travel, and remote controlled couplings. Both bogies will be driven, with a motor in each. The first release will be with Epoch III markings in both chrome oxide green and steel blue.

Repeat issues:

VT98/VB98/VS98 railbus (Epochs III and IV) with an improved mechanism for even better performance.

DB bogie Umbauwagen - composite, second, and second baggage in Epoch III and IV versions, now with programmable interior lighting, imitating the start-up of fluorescent tubes.





KM₁

One of the most interesting announcements at the Fair was that these Gauge 1 specialists would also be producing models in O (and Ilm, or G - q.v.). Two principal factors were cited: the time, effort, and resources taken to research a top quality model could be applied to any scale, and modern technology makes it relatively easy to adapt the designs to other sizes. In addition, all the digital technology is immediately transferable, with consequent economies of scale. But further, the same production methods are also more susceptible to security issues, especially where third parties and sub-contractors in Asia are involved. Even if the original files were not 'leaked', the technology facilitates 'imitation', and beyond the choice of the same popular (and thus perhaps obvious) prototypes. KM1 accordingly decided that the best tactic was to widen their activities. In anticipation, they have increased capacity at their premises in Germany. The new O gauge catalogue, A4 landscape format, is 64 pages - twice as many as the new Gauge 1 publication. All the illustrations show existing Gauge 1 models.

The planned new items are:

BR44 2-10-0, coal and oil, in twelve versions from DRG to DR and DB.

BR01 Pacific with original boiler, in ten versions from DRG to DR and DB.

BR23 2-6-2 DB new build, in eight versions.

BR91³ (Prussian T9.3) 2-6-0T, in eight versions from Epoch I to IIIb.

BR98³ (Bavarian Pt2/2) 0-4-0T 'Glaskasten', in seven versions from Epoch I to IIIb.

BR82 0-10-0T DB new build, in ten versions, including as preserved.

V90 (BR290) DB B-B diesel hydraulic, in ten versions from Epoch III to V.

Standard 1921 four-wheel compartment coaches and matching baggage van.

Standard 24m³ and 30m³ four-wheel tank wagons. Type O 02 Schwerin open and type K 06 Wuppertal lidded four-wheel wagons, in twelve versions from Epoch I to IV.

There will also be accessories (signals, etc.), figures, and scenic materials.

No delivery schedule is given.

Not at the Fair, but still active. The website shows: BR78, sample end March, delivery mid year.

BR44, sample April, delivery July.

All are planned in several versions, and all are represented at this stage with CAD graphics.





Schnellenkamp

The O gauge specialist is working on the Italian type 28 and 29 peaked roof four-wheel vans, as highly detailed plastic models in 1:45, with equalised suspension and sprung buffers. They will come with NEM (Lenz) couplings fitted, with scale couplers also supplied. There will be variants with four, two, or no (DR version) ventilators in the sides, and some will have a brake house. Various markings will be offered.

Current projects – Kö I diesel: no delivery date yet. Standard type O11 four-wheel open coal wagon: in production, delivery expected early in the year.

The same applies to the standard type K15 fourwheel wagon with lids. The lids can be opened and held in place with chains, as per prototype.

Low and high *Lichtsperrsignal* (shunting signals) are also being developed.



Fulgurex

Bern Lötschberg Simplon Be6/8 (later Ae6/8), both the 1926 Breda and 1941 Séchéron variants. Four versions are listed, two from each batch, with one or two pantographs; only forty will be made.

The Nord/SNCF 221 Atlantic is still listed in six versions – Nord brown with regular or 37m³ tender, Paris - Orléans grey, État black, MIDI green, and SNCF green.

Reservations are still being taken for the Nord/SNCF Train Automoteur Rapide (TAR) high speed diesel train introduced in 1936 and used mainly between Paris and Lille and Lille and Boulogne. Only twenty three-car sets will be made, in either Nord or SNCF versions.



Nohab/AFB diesel in plastic, as NSB Di3a (two numbers, red-brown and new red) and Di3b (one red-brown, already sold out), plus Belgian series 202/204 green (two numbers) and Luxemburg 1600 as delivered (lighter red) versions, each with option of digital sound – the speaker is already mounted. Front skirts/snow-ploughs with either scale or Lenz couplings supplied. Nohab and AFB machines differ in some body details (e.g headlights), the fuel tanks, the battery boxes, and the bogie frames.

All locos have working directionally-controlled head and tail lights, separately switchable in digital mode. Switchable features on digital locos depend on the controller used.

Most models are designed to run on a standard minimum radius of 1,020mm.

New tooling – the unique V320 C-C diesel hydraulic. 719mm long and 7kg in weight! Metal construction with many added details, two motors, all axles driven, digital sound, stay-alive capacitor, working lights, cab and machine room lights switchable, motor-driven fans, smoke from all exhausts.

Versions: Epoch III – DB V320; Epoch IV – DB BR232; Hersfelder Kreisbahn No.30 in orange, with round radio aerial; in Teutoburger Wald Eisenbahn orange, with additional aerial and cab side window rainstrips; in SerFer yellow, as used on construction work in Italy, with modified bogie sandboxes; and Epoch VI – 'H.F.Wiebe' yellow, with small radio aerial, as used between 1999 and 2015. The HK, TWE, and Italian versions are limited editions, to be ordered before the end of March.

Epoch III – DB four-wheel flat with brake platform carrying three long gas cylinders.

DB four-wheel tank wagon with brake platform, used by 'Aral'.

DB type G10 van with reinforced ends and no brake house equipped for livestock transport, with wooden hurdles in the open doorways, supplied with a kit for a loading ramp and two barriers, and even four goats! Also planned is a Magirus Merkur 120 S lorry with wooden slats around the load area.

The type G10 van will also be offered with DR Epoch IV markings.

The Märklin Museum limited edition wagon for this year, only available from the Märklineum in Göppingen, is a type E040 four-wheel open wagon with DB Epoch IV markings, lettered for 'Verzinkerei Kopf'.

KM1 Modellbau

Once again KM1 did not have a stand (though a working layout with some of their models formed part of the Roco/Fleischmann stand, to demonstrate the Z21XL digital central unit) but visited to see the German model press and make samples available for photography.

A landscape format A4 size 32 page brochure details future projects.

They offer high quality, highly detailed models, fitted as standard with a sound decoder plus a patented synchronised smoke generator, with separate functions to issue 'steam' from the cylinders and (on the latest products) even the whistle. They have directional headlights, running gear lights, cab lights, and firebox glow (also synchronised). All functions are also switchable. Fine scale wheels are an option at extra cost. The axles are sprung, and like the drive carried in roller bearings, driven by a powerful Maxon motor. Buffers are sprung, and scale couplings fitted (though these can be changed for claw couplers). Loco and tender are close coupled. They are not all intended to cope with the Märklin minimum radius of 1,020mm.







The programme includes:

Württemberg C class Pacific, later BR18¹, first sample received.

Prussian T3, later BR89, 0-6-0T, nine versions from Epoch I to preserved, first sample received.

Prussian T9³, later BR91³, 2-6-0T, seven versions from Epoch I to IIIb.

DB VT95 four-wheel diesel railcar and VB142 trailer, plus VB141 single axle luggage trailer, in various combinations.

Klv12 inspection draisine, first sample received. Six-wheel and bogie DB *Umbauwagen*, composite, second, and second baggage, both Epoch III and IV.

Standard four-wheel tank wagon 30m³ capacity,

with brake house or brake platform, according to period. Ten versions from Epoch II to IV, for various users, three or four numbers each.

The type Tnfhs insulated four-wheel van will now be produced in brass, not plastic. First sample received.

The Talbot small four-wheel ballast hopper is expected in the middle of the year.

Samples were shown of some projects illustrated last year: DB E50/BR150 Co-Co electric, expected March; E16 1-Do-1 electric, expected April; DB BR216 B-B diesel; type Btms33 four-wheel flat with four small tank containers; works train Wohnschlafwagen on the basis of a 1921 four-wheel compartment coach, with an appropriate four-wheel lowside wagon.















MBW

The current programme includes:
BR92 0-8-0T (first quarter).
BR56²⁰⁻²⁹ 2-8-0 (middle of the year).
BR53 2-6-8-0 (proposed, but never built)(August).
BR80 0-6-0T (third quarter).

The BR65 2-8-4T announced last year is not now due until next year.

The BR74 (former Prussian T12) 2-6-0T is also planned for 2021.

The DB pre-series E10 Bo-Bo electric is suggested, with no delivery date.

The Voith Gravita 10BB diesel could be produced if there is sufficient demand.

All are listed in several versions. Most are illustrated with prototype pictures or graphics.

The V320/BR232 C-C diesel is added to the range, manufactured as a combination of die cast metal and brass with a few small plastic parts, fitted with ESU digital equipment (including sound).

The V160/BR216 'Lollo' B-B diesel is also added to the range, with a similar specification.

Double-deck coaches may be produced if there is sufficient demand.







New project: Tbis^{870/871} sliding side/roof wagons.
There will be more Krupp eight-wheel tank wagons as limited editions. Currently listed in Epoch II and III versions, photos have been found showing these wagons still in operation in the 1970s, so extra Epoch IV versions will be produced. The first deliveries should arrive in August.

Fulgurex

The current list is:

BLS Ce4/6, later (from 1950) 4/4, 1-B-B-1 rod-coupled bogie electric, seventeen of which were introduced from 1924, in five versions: c.1925 brown; c.1958 green, with one pantograph; c.1960 brown; c.1952, rebuilt, green; c.1961 rebuilt, brown.

– SBB Fe4/4, later (after 1963) De4/4, baggage railcar dating from 1927/8, in five versions: c.1929 green; c.1931 blue & white, the so-called 'Zürich' livery; c.1950 Seetal red-brown; c.1963 green, modified with one pantograph; and c.1964 Seetal red-brown, also with one pantograph.





Mo-Miniatur

Best known for road vehicles, and industrial or agricul tural machinery.

The powered model of the DB Klv12 inspection draisine, which lasted in service until 1997, is still being developed. It will represent the most well-known variant, with rounded bonnet. The model will include a multi-protocol sound decoder with several light functions. The original plan was to make it in brass, but now KM1 are also doing it, this one will have a resin body. A static version (with resin chassis and wheels) will also be offered. Both due late summer.

A small four-wheel trailer is also being developed.

The other rolling stock project is quite a contrast – the type Saadkms⁶⁹⁰ low floor 'rolling road' eight axle bogie flat, which will be of brass construction and over 600mm long! They are aiming to show a first sample at the Sinsheim Gauge 1 Meet in June.

B-Models (Euro Tank Car)

This Belgian specialist offers versions of a modern kinked tank bogie wagon with brake platform and sprung buffers in very limited quantities.

Narrow gauge

German narrow gauge in HO scale

Tillig

The narrow gauge range again has its own 16 page leaflet. The major excitement is planned models of the Harz 0-4-4-0 Mallet tanks, both as Nordhausen Wernigerode Eisenbahn (Epoch II) and Deutsche Reichsbahn (Epoch III) variants (Q4).

Epoch II – New version of the four-wheel diesel railcar as Gernrode-Harzgeroder Eisenbahn T1 in red & cream (Q1).

Set of three four-wheel wagons, NWE open and van and GHE van (Q2).

Epoch III – DR mixed train, with 99.57 0-6-0T (Spreewald), KBD4i second/baggage, KB4i second, and Gw four-wheel van (Q2). The bogie coaches have original square corner windows, and the second/baggage is new tooling. These vehicles are former Sachsen 750mm gauge transferred and converted.

Type Ow four-wheel open with raised brake seat, loaded with aluminium ingots (Q1).

Epoch IV - DR 0-6-0T 99 6102 (Q2).

KB4i second with modernised windows in red & cream (Q2).

New tooling – KBD4i second/baggage with modernised windows in red & cream (Q2). An unpainted sample was shown.

Limited edition (to be ordered by the end of March)
– set of three bogie coaches in two-tone green, KBD4i
second/baggage, KB4 second, and an older Harz
second with 'Harzer Roller' lettering.

Epoch V-VI – set of two rebuilt KB coaches in HSB red & cream (Q3). To match, rebuilt KBD second/baggage, with modernised baggage doors (Q3).

All items will also be offered for HOe (9mm gauge), with the running numbers freelanced.

Bemo

Württemberg Tssd Mallet 0-4-4-0T as the preserved (and since 2015 running again) 99 633 on the Öchsle line. Only offered as a Metal Collection ready-to-run model.

Back after ten years – the Sachsen IIK alt double Fairlie, ready-to-run as No.18 in black or No.19 in green, or as a kit. Orders must be placed by 1st May.

Only as an assembled model, the Sachsen IVK Meyer 0-4-4-0T as DR 99 608, as currently operated by the Sächsische Dampfeisenbahn Gesellschaft (SDG) and based at Freital-Hainsberg.

There will be two more examples of the standard 2-10-2T with Epoch III identities, 99 750 from Freital-Hainsberg and Zittau-based 99 735, the latter without the small snow clearers.

The L45H bogie diesel is to be re-run so several versions will be available again: BVO Verkehrsbetriebe Erzgebirge GmbH (BVO) original blue, BVO later DR-style red, SDG DR-style red, Stainzer Lokalbahn violet, and Österreichische Gesellschaft für Lokalbahnen (ÖGLB) blue.

There is also the possibility of another version – as CFF 87 0036, in yellow livery, as presently used on the Wassertal forestry and tourist line in Romania. It will only be produced if enough orders are received by 1st May. The livery was chosen as similar to that on locos of this type latterly used on track maintenance trains in Italy and France.







Veit

Modellbau Veit produces high quality models of metal construction, with a Faulhaber motor, and a decoder socket, offered both as kits and assembled.

New this year is the Deutsche Reichsbahn insideframed 0-8-0T 99 4643, originally built in 1922 by Orenstein & Koppel for the Kleinbahnen des Kreises Jerichow I and substantially rebuilt in 1964. It was used first on the Burg narrow gauge network, then went to the Prignitz in October 1965. After four years of use it was moved to Bergen on the island of Rügen and worked on the section to the Wittower ferry until 1970. It was later sold as a heating unit and was unfortunately not preserved.

The model has a Faulhaber motor and is offered as a kit or assembled, correctly detailed for the Burg, Prignitz, and Rügen versions, all for Epoch III.

There will be a new run of the Sachsen 1906 5.5m transporter wagons with plate frame bogies, this time with markings for the Prignitz network (Epoch III, two numbers).



The still outstanding items announced in the last couple of years should be delivered in the course of this year.

Available now is a small four-wheel maintenance trolley.

Also in stock is a new version of the Sachsen fourwheel goods van in Zittau - Oybin - Jonsdorf Eisenbahn (Z.O.J.E.) grey.

This will be followed in the second quarter by a matching open wagon. Both have pulleys for the Heberlein brake system.









Roco

A new version of the Austrian Rh2095 B-B rod-coupled diesel is planned in Deutsche Reichsbahn red & cream, classified V60K and numbered V60 4801, representing a loco supposedly evaluated by the DR in 1963. It could have happened ... but it did not! Even if a loco had been loaned, it is unlikely to have been repainted and renumbered. The 10mm difference in gauge should not have been a problem, as evidenced by the visit of a IVK (99 1542) to an Austrian preserved line (the Ybbstalbahn) in July and August 2017. The success of any diesel on the DR narrow gauge would have lead to the scrapping rather than refurbishment of the IVKs.

Epoch III-IV – new version of the Rügen type KDp four-wheel baggage van.

Epoch IV – set of two transporters for standard gauge wagons.

Feldbahn start set: six-wheel industrial diesel, four bogie tubs, oval of track, simple analogue controller.

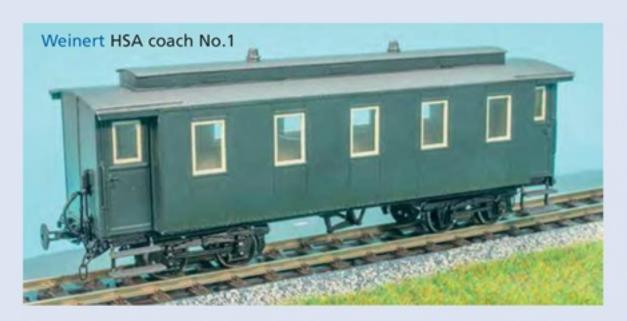
Lemke

New version of the Bayerische Zugspitzbahn fourwheel steeple cab electric 'valley' loco (as used between Garmisch-Partenkichen and Grainau, i.e. not the rack section) and bogie coaches in the later darker blue & white livery. They will be sold in sets of a loco with two coaches and two additional coaches. They will be available as prototypical HOm or HOe, and also now in HO.

Brawa

The DR BR1998 C-C conversion of the BR110 diesel for the Harz has been upgraded like the standard gauge model – though brochure does not actually mention the gauge! The model is supplied as HOm but HOe wheelsets, etc. are included.







Weinert

Two of the kits for Harz locos will be re-run this year: the standard BR99²³ 2-10-2T, either coal or oil fired, and the unique 2-6-2T, NWE No.21, later 99 6001, with either original riveted or later welded tanks. As usual, the main structure is whitemetal, with brass detailing parts, and a pre-assembled mechanism. The models are offered with a choice of five-pole Mashima or Faulhaber motors, and in HOe as well as the proper HOm.

New are two kits for rolling stock from the Hoya -Syke - Asendorf metre gauge line: short clerestory roof bogie coach No.1, and standard/metre gauge barrier wagon No.162, with two sets of buffing gear and substantial ballast weights.



Schlosser

This maker produces high quality etched brass models with cast brass details, offered either as kits, with transfers and full instructions, or assembled.

Harz short four-wheel open wagon Ord 92 with brake cabin and standard gauge buffers for shunting the transfer sidings, as a kit or assembled, expected end of April.

Kreisbahn Osterode Kreiensen clerestory roof bogie coach with open balconies, as a kit or assembled, expected end of April.

DRG standard bogie coaches for the Sachsen narrow gauge, type B4 sa29 second, with either open or shrouded solebars, and type C4 sa30 third (shrouded solebars only), to scale length and width, as kits or assembled models in DR condition. Finished examples were shown of 970 001 in green, built in 1929, as before modernisation in 1991; 900 514 in two-tone green, transferred from Saxony to the Harz and regauged in 1958, as before rebuilding in 1986-7; and 900 492 in red & cream, transferred from Oberwiesenthal to the Harz in 1954, as before rebuilding in 1986. Others came to the Harz after service on the Spreewald network and Eisfeld line.

Wagons for the Prignitz network announced last year, a four-wheel insulated milk van with brake platform, in Epoch III, IV, and preserved forms, and a short bogie flat with side stakes with either fully enclosed or partially open brake house, are now due in the summer.



Minitrains Karlsruhe Schlossgarten Greif 0-4-0 + coaches

Minitrains

Henschel 'Riesa' type 70hp industrial 0-4-0T in three versions – black, green, and grey. Also as adapted into an American style loco with tender, open cab, spark arrestor stack, and cowcatcher, as used on the Karlsruhe Schlossgartenbahn, named *Greif*.

To accompany – semi-open bogie coaches in both red and green.

Reminiscent of the classic Eggerbahn model, but rather finer, and with a much better mechanism, there is a Henschel 0-4-0 enclosed body tram loco, based on a prototype from the Geldersch-Overijsselche Stoomtramweg Maatschappij in The Netherlands.

Busch

HOf – Feldbahn start set, with Gmeinder closed cab 15/18PS four-wheel diesel in grey with two wagons carrying bricks, oval of track, battery controller. To accompany a set of brickworks buildings.

New versions: the Gmeinder 15/18PS four-wheel diesel, without cab, in blue; Deutz OMZ 112F four-wheel rod-coupled diesel, with cab, in grey; LKM Ns2f four-wheel diesel, without cab in black, with cab in red; B360 battery electric mine loco in yellow. All locos now have a working headlight.

Hand operated crane on a skip chassis.

V-skip with brake platform, and brakeman.

Pack of two loco drivers, one sitting, one standing. Set of three mine tubs.

Set of two mine tubs with covers, for equipment and explosives.

Set of two mine manriders.



Artitec

As part of their extensive range of scenic accessories and road vehicles, Artitec offer a Henschel type 'Fabian' industrial 0-4-0T in HOf as an assembled static model.

REE

The Billard A80D diesel autorail, dating from 1936, is making progress – an advance model was shown, with a transparent body shell; delivery is expected in the spring. It will have working head and tail lights, and



interior lighting. DCC sound is an option, recorded on the CF du Vivarais. Four number/livery versions are proposed initially: CFD 313 and 314 in Epoch III red and pearl grey; CFV ruby & cream with aluminium roof, as in tourist service (Epoch IV); and CFV red & grey (Epoch IV-V).

Also on show were what seemed to be well advanced examples of a selection of four-wheel goods wagons – a flat, an open, and van, using the same underframe, with and without brakes. They will come in various liveries and be sold in pairs, some mixed; the vans will include a couple of colourful private owners ('Orezza' yellow and 'Mattei' red) as well as the standard greys and browns. All will be supplied with wheelsets for both HOm (12mm) and HOe (9mm).

Now such wagons would not be appropriate behind an *autorail*, so it is a logical to assume a loco must be on the way – REE are planning the CFD BB-400 diesel with rod-coupled bogies, for release in 2021. Four versions are proposed: Vivarais, Provence, P-O Corrèze, and Corsica.

Ferivan

The range of Belgian Vicinal stock in HOm is now run by Jan Martens. Although not exhibiting he visited to distribute information and show samples.

Two versions of the modern Belgian Hermelijn low floor trams have been produced as unpowered models by Rietze exclusively for Ferivan, one single ended for Antwerp and one double ended for Ghent. They come with 32 destination boards printed on photo paper for the modeller to select, cut out, and apply. They should be available in the first quarter.

Antwerp PCC bogie cars in both cream and red & white are due in the second quarter as motorised models.

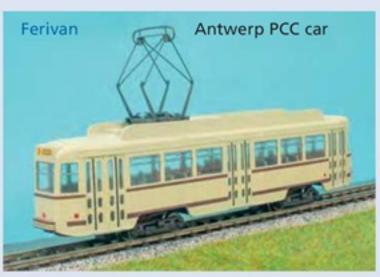
A Vicinal Braine-le-Comte four-wheel electric tram, from series 9880-9889, will be produced in the third quarter as an anniversary model (motorised) to mark thirty years of Ferivan – it was one of their first models. Numbers will be supplied as waterslide transfers.

All vehicles are offered in HO as well as authentic HOm.











Tramfabriek

Backer & Rueb HTM 8 *Ooievaar*, one of six built in 1904 for the tramway company in The Hague. After a long and varied history it has been preserved and is running now between Hoorn and Medemblik.

Tramfabriek offer this steam tram as it is currently in service. It will be available in H0, H0m, and H0e. The model has an etched nickel-silver body with small parts cast in brass and a finely detailed 3D-printed boiler. The belt-drive mechanism will be supplied ready to run; it runs realistically slowly, and has working headlights. Standard couplings are fitted.

Austrian narrow gauge in HOe

Roco

New version of the Mh Engerth 0-8+4 as ÖBB 399.02, as running in the 1980s. The digital model has soundlab sound.

New version of the Rh2095 B-B diesel as 2097.07 in red with silver lining and different style ÖBB logos on each end, as repaired after a serious accident on the Bregenzerwald line in January 1982. The digital model has soundlab sound.

Modified tooling – type SSm/s bogie flat wagon, as modified with new floors, robust steel stakes welded to the sides, winches for tie-down cables, a new end panel between the loading area and the brake platform, and chequer plate brake platform surface. The new model is offered singly, and in a twin pack loaded with logs.

Liliput

New versions of the U class 0-6-2T as ÖBB 298.06, named *Mariapfarr* as preserved by Club 760; as Zillertal No.2 *Zillertal*, with spark arrestor chimney, as currently in service; and as Zillertal No.1 *Raimund*, with straight chimney, in Epoch III condition. (As No.2 is presently running on the Welshpool and Llanfair Light Railway – real life copying what so many British narrow gauge modellers have already done! – we wonder if Bachmann will take the opportunity to offer this model in their OO9 range ...)

New versions of the four-wheel inspection railcar, as VT95 of the Steyrtalbahn in red and NÖVÖG OB1 in yellow, currently allocated to the Waldviertel lines.

The matching four-wheel flat trailer, with and without side boards, will also be re-run.

The standard four-wheel coaches benefit from finer end railings. New versions include a composite and second in Zillertal Epoch III brown with spoked wheels, and three in the current red livery, with names – composite 'Ramsau/Hippach' and seconds 'Gemeinde Tux' and 'Gemeinde Strass'.

There will also be a new range representing those currently used on the Waldviertel lines, in green livery, with different markings each side. Three are listed this year, and more should follow.

There will be a set of four four-wheel coaches in ÖBB green with Epoch III-IV markings, a baggage van and three coaches (with two different roof types and either older wooden frame or replacement aluminium frame windows). The type B4ipho/s bogie coach will also be released to match.

Ferro-Train

Models from this specialist are now marketed direct.

To mark 110 years since the electrification of the Mariazellerbahn with single phase alternating current at 6,500 volts 25 Hertz, for which sixteen rod-coupled C-C locomotives (later ÖBB Rh1099) were delivered in three batches, there will be a new edition of the popular model with the original 'box' body, with a choice of numbers across Epochs I to III.

Bemo

The four-page A4 leaflet distributed at Nürnberg may not include all that may be announced in the course of the year. There will be further bulletins in the summer and the autumn.

Most proposals are illustrated with prototype pictures.

Most motive power has the option of a factory-fitted ESU multi-protocol sound decoder.

Rhätische Bahn

There will be new versions of the Bernina line railcars, both 40 and 50 series, now with LED lights and a Next18 (NEM 662) decoder socket – ABe4/4 43 in redbrown, ABe4/4 55 *Diavolezza* in red, and ABe4/4 53 *Tirano* in new red.

Two new versions of the Ge4/4^{II} universal loco are planned, as 627 *Reichenau-Tamins* in current new red condition, and as 628 *S-chanf* with 'FAIRTIQ' advertising; orders for this must be received by 1st May. The models have a revised chassis, with LED lighting and MTC21 (NEM 660) decoder socket.

The Ge4/4^{III} high power loco is also planned in two new versions: 647 *Grüsch* in new red with large Rhätische Bahn lettering, and 644 *Savognin* likewise but with the short-lived trial all red body (i.e. no grey skirt) – this will be a limited edition. The models now have LED lighting and a Next18 (NEM 662) decoder socket.

The Albula low floor 'Alvra' coaches are now being delivered and finished examples of all body types were displayed, with the exception of the driving trailer, which should be released soon. The trains are made up of seven coaches (one of each type, but two seconds).

Interior lighting kits will be made available in due course.

Standard coaches will be produced in current new red: EWII A1264 and EWI B2343 (both blue brake markers) and B2360 (orange brake markers).

which were ordered in 2018 with modified seating.

The old open balcony bogie coaches announced last year are almost ready for release.

Two vintage four-wheel coaches, C2012 and C2026 (currently being restored by Club 1889 to run with G3/4 2-6-0T No.1 Rhätia), will be modelled as preserved, representing Landquart Davos Bahn Nos. C32 and C66.

There will also be a model of four-wheel lowside M7070 as restored by young members of Club 1889.

More modern freight is represented by a new version of a type R-w bogie flat carrying two rubbish skips operated by 'Crüzer'.

New tooling – in 1948, fifteen four-wheel tank wagons were ordered by the Petrola company for use on various metre gauge lines to carry aviation fuel, supplying military bases in the Alpine valleys until the 1990s. Bemo will produce the model in RhB grey (five numbers), Montreux Oberland Bahn red oxide (three numbers), and SBB grey (three numbers). Orders must be received by 1st May. An advance sample was shown.

The Metal Collection model of the year will be the snow spreader Xk9132 in red oxide livery, as running c.1974, after installation of remotely controlled hydraulic operation of the blades. To be ordered by 1st May.

There will be a Metal Collection model of the Bernina goods railcar De2/2 151, again in red oxide, as running 1974-1980, with wooden body, scissors pantograph, and resistance braking grid on the roof. To be ordered by 1st May.

Furka Oberalp

In the second half of the year Bemo plan to deliver the FO railcar BDeh2/4 41-45 with driving trailer ABt 4191-4194 announced last year.

Pi.R.A.T.A.

A new range of Rhätische Bahn freight wagons is proposed, made entirely in Italy.

The first will be a type Gb-k four-wheel van with brake platform, as a set of three in plain brown plus two advertising livery singles: 'Cargo Domizil' blue and 'Badraun' green.

They are noted as HO but are presumably HOm (though the graphic illustrating them has N gauge couplers!).

Fulgurex

The Aigle-Sépey-Diablerets (ASD) ABFe4/4 railcar No.11 was shown unpainted.

It will be sold in sets with a type K van and a type M wagon, with different numbers.

Type K vans, type L lowsides, and type M open wagons will be available separately.

The railcar requires a minimum radius of 420mm.

Kato

Rhätische Bahn 1:150 scale running on 9mm (N) track. The Glacier Express start and extension sets (with Ge4/4^{|||} loco and Panoramic coaches) will be re-run.

There will be a new version of the Ge4/4^{||} as 623 with 'Glacier Express' lettering. The model has LED lighting, and can be converted to DCC by exchanging the circuit board.

Brand new is the WR3811 'Gourmino' restaurant car, in blue livery, with authentically coloured internal detail and interior lighting.

Pi.R.A.T.A.

The Italian N specialists are developing their range of Rhätische Bahn metre gauge stock on 9mm track (matching the Kato models).

There will be a set of three EWI coaches in green livery, with a first available separately.

For the Arosa line, they will produce a first, a second, and a second baggage in the blue livery with flower decoration, and a second in red with 'Bārenland' graphics.

Restaurant car WR 3822 in red livery is also planned. The four-wheel type Gb-k vans will be repeated from HOm (or is it the other way round?) – as a set of three in plain brown plus two advertising livery singles: 'Cargo Domizil' blue and 'Badraun' green.













All three variants of the type Sp-w bogie flats will be re-run (single side stakes, double side stakes, and double side stakes with end bulkheads), and there will also be a type SI bogie flat with lightweight side panels.

Nm

AB-Modell

This specialist offers further finishes on the Kato models. They can also adapt the locos and stock to 6.5mm gauge.

Their own product line consists of hand-crafted nickel-silver scale models of metre gauge locos and stock to the correct 1:160 scale on 6.5mm gauge.

The Ge4/4^{III}, which has been in the programme for years, will be issued as 650 in 'UNESCO World Heritage' light blue livery. It will be a nickel-silver hand-crafted model with two Faulhaber motors and flywheel only for 6.5mm gauge. (For 9mm, Kato models in the same livery are available from stock.)

The nickel-silver Ge4/4^{||} is due in two further versions: first, 618 in red with the striking RhB logo, which









replaces the now almost sold out version in the all red livery. The model has raised letters for the coat of arms and community name 'Bergün'. Second, 622 with 'Hakone Tozan Railway' graphics, as running in 2010. These models are equipped with a Faulhaber motor and a large flywheel, and come with a Zimo decoder which also works automatically on analogue layouts.

The already announced bogie baggage van D4210 with two large sliding doors on each side will appear this year. The completely new model is made of nickel-silver and is equipped with smooth-running wheelsets. Two versions are planned: with a narrow silver line and the more modern, wide light grey stripe.

The identical Furka Oberalp baggage van will follow in the course of the year, with its slightly darker colour and silver sliding doors.

On the basis of the popular four-wheel baggage van, an attractive colour variation will be created: the D² 4052^{II} Rhätia Stübli, as used in the RhB historic train. AB-Modell have even painted curtains behind the window panes!

Also new is the NEVA low floor driving trailer. BDt 1751 was developed together with an Austrian modeller; it has a nickel-silver body with full 3D-printed interior equipment, and the well-known smooth-running bogies from AB-Modell.

All these vehicles will be produced with several different numbers, as appropriate, and are only available for 6.5mm gauge.

The wagon range has been further expanded in the form of the type Sbk-v low-floor bogie flat and the









four-wheel type Lb-v 7871 flat, and this year these models will be equipped with a Co-op swap body with salad motif. Each release will have a new running number. The Co-op train has now grown to five different motifs

AB-Modell also have some new accessories and scenic items, which are featured in the relevant section.

Om

Bemo

The Ge4/4^{II} electric is now available. Two variants are offered – a first series machine with either round (618 Bergün) or rectangular (613 Domat/Ems) headlights.

Due this year is a re-run of 627 Reichenau-Tamins (with round headlights), and two special versions for which orders should be received by 1st May – 612 Thusis in green (with roof resistances as per prototype) and 619 in the 'Bernina 100 years' livery. Only as many as are ordered will be made.

Work continues on the EWI short bogie coaches, placed in service in 1968 and 1972. Initial releases should be a composite and two seconds in red with either the stylised logo in white or the later silver logo. A body shell on bogies was shown.

There will be new versions of the type Lb-v fourwheel container flat with two different 'Co-op' refrigerated containers, carrot and lettuce; of the type Fb metal bodied high side open wagon, in red-brown and grey. Four different load inserts are available – waste wood, scrap, scrap with girders, and scrap with pipes.

The next wagon will be the type E wooden bodied high side open, with and without metal panel inserts, each in two numbers. A sample was shown, and release is scheduled for the spring.

Schnellenkamp

This specialist plans a new range of authentic German metre gauge stock, beginning with a standard Orenstein & Koppel type MV8 0-4-0 diesel, which should appear at the end of the year. The prototype was used by a large number of railways in Germany and beyond, sometimes double heading: Sauerländer Kleinbahn, Hohenlimburg, and HH-Wandsbek, as well as Belgium and Switzerland to name just a few. Some are still running. The models will be produced exactly to 1:45 in mixed metal/plastic construction. They will have digital decoders with original sound. They will come fitted with Kadee On3 knuckle couplings, but exchange for other types is possible without problems.

The A4 landscape format brochure has 52 pages, a few more than last year.

German narrow gauge

Sachsen clerestory roof four-wheel third and second/ third composite, and close-coupled second + third pair.

New version of the Sachsen IVK as DR 99 587, with digital sound and synchronised smoke.

Suitable bogie coaches – planked body second and second with luggage space, plus a baggage van.

The club model of the year is a bogie 'Barwagen' in red livery as operated by SOEG on the Zittau system. It has a new roof, and a fully detailed interior. Only available to LGB Club members, and orders had to be received by the end of February.

New version of the standard metre gauge 2-10-2T, now known from the Harz, in photographic grey livery as 99 221, with digital sound, synchronised smoke, and 'steam' also from cylinders. Due in the second quarter.

New tooling – LKM V10C 0-6-0 diesel as 199 006-8 in Epoch VI Harz orange livery, with digital sound decoder.

Four-wheel tram and trailer in 'Kirnitzschtalbahn' yellow, with digital sound for the first time.

Two American style bogie lowsides (gondolas) with DB Epoch IV markings.

The Museum wagon for the year, only available from the Märklineum in Göppingen, is a four-wheel van with raised brake house decorated for 'Schmidt Lebkuchen' of Nürnberg.

Feldbahn range

The Ns2f four-wheel diesel as presently used on the short restored section of the once extensive Mecklenburg Pommersche Schmalspurbahnen (MPSB), and a pair of matching four-wheel coaches. The loco is now for the first time fitted with the MTC21 decoder socket.

Small four-wheel passenger wagon, with bench seats and awning.

French metre gauge

A new version of the Corpet, Louvet 0-6-0T, for the first time with a digital sound decoder factory fitted, as Côtes du Nord No.36 in red livery, as preserved at the Musée des Tramways à Vapeur et Secondaires (MTVS), now running between Crèvecour-le-Grand and Rotangy. To accompany – four-wheel coach ABf7 in lined green and four-wheel van D 370 in grey.













Swiss metre gauge

'High End' all metal model of the Swiss-built HG4/4 0-8-0RT from Vietnam, as recently restored for use on the Furka Bergstrecke. Samples were running on a demonstration track, one unpainted model with brass components, one in green as No.704. The unpainted model is shown on the inside front cover of the brochure, almost as if squeezed in as an afterthought. A version as No.701 in black livery is mentioned as an addition. The appropriate pages of the brochure describe the coaches and present a prototype picture.

To accompany – two four-wheel open balcony coaches in Furka Bergstrecke lined red livery. The matching 'Steam Pub' coach is in preparation.

The recent new model of the Rhätische Bahn Ge6/6^{II} will appear as 707 *Scuol* in original green livery, with digital sound and pantographs that can be remotely raised and lowered.

Four-wheel open balcony RhB second in green & cream.

EWI bogie coach with 'Bärenland' graphics, as used on the Arosa line.

Type Za bogie tank wagon used by 'Conrad Storz'.

Type Hai-tvz sliding side bogie van with new 'Bündner Güterbahn' branding; the sides open as per prototype.

Matterhorn Gotthard Bahn panoramic coach with 'Aprés-ski-bar' graphics.

America

ATSF F7A diesel in the red & silver 'Warbonnet' livery, choice of two numbers, both powered and with digital sound, and the matching B unit as a dummy (but with loudspeaker which can be connected to either A unit). The bodies are partly chromed to replicate the original finish. Lighting functions include long distance headlight and oscillating Mars light.

To accompany – appropriate streamlined passenger cars: tail observation, dome observation, diner, sitting car, and baggage van, all with interior lighting.

These often make use of wood for the packing or support framework, and have realistic lashings and fixings. As appropriate, they come authentically weathered.

HO – for four-wheel opens – loose coal; aluminium coils. For bogie opens: loose coal; briquettes; gate valve.

For bogie stake wagons: empty large cable drums; over-long steel billets; old metal pipes (one long and two short stacks, for two wagons); large steel I-beam; large square tube with a kink.

For heavy duty bogie flats: winch under a partial tarpaulin; steel shaft box sections; large flanged pipe with two kinks; large tyres on a pallet under a tarpaulin; construction machinery engines; steel plates; sections of square ventilation duct.

For road trailers: turbine roller; over-long steel girder fabrication; buffer tank; mixing container parts.

N - for four-wheel lowsides: coils of wire.

For bogie flats/lowsides: aluminium rods; square ventilation duct parts.

For heavy duty bogie flats: pressure tank.

O – for bogie flats: pipe junction with ventilator fan; hydrogen tank; pressure valves for pipelines, on a carrying frame; curved pipes; winch under a partial tarpaulin.

Die V300-Familie der Deutschen Reichsbahn Band 1: Entwicklung, Technik und Umbauten

The EK-Baureihen series first included a book on the Deutsche Reichsbahn V300 family in 2001. Since then much has changed, with further developments for Deutsche Bahn AG, such as more rebuilds of Class 232 into Class 233 and 241/241.8, and sales to numerous private railway companies in Germany and elsewhere in mainland Europe. It was therefore time for a second edition. This new publication describes the development and technical details of the V300 locomotives and the many rebuilds which have been undertaken, together with all their detail differences.

The work begins with an illustrated 'family tree' of all the V300 family classes, from 130/230 to 214 and 242, under the title 'Stammbaum der V300-Familie der Deutschen Reichsbahn'.

The first chapter, 'Sowjetische Großdieselloks für die Traktionumstellung bei der DR' looks at the development of these Russian-built diesel locos from the October Revolution Locomotive Works in Lugansk.

The second chapter, 'Der Lokomotivtyp T3109 – Keimzelle der V300-Familie' provides a detailed account of the Russian-built T3109 type diesel locos in their various forms. Also included is a reproduction of an advertisement for the type from the Soviet Export Organisation V/O Energomach.

'Beginn der Lieferungen an die DR' covers the start of deliveries to the DR of classes 130 – 142, with extracts from official manuals and tables giving technical details.

The next chapter, 'Messtechnische Untersuchungen zum Nachweis der Eigenschaften', covers tests carried out on these locos and features graphs showing power unit output and electric brake performances.

'Die Technische Beschreibung der Lokomotiven' provides schematic drawings, and technical details are thoroughly described and illustrated. There are close-up views of bogies, cabs, power units, traction motors, and cooling fans.

'Änderungen und Umbauten an der Baureihen 132/232 bei der DR and DB AG' includes numerous tables with statistics giving a full account of all the alterations and rebuilds. There is a useful table for modellers showing all the different styles and positioning of bodyside air intake grilles.

The next chapter, 'Umbauten an Lokomotiven der V300-Familie außerhalb von DR and DB AG' is similar but centres on locos which been altered or rebuilt for operators other than DR and DB AG. This includes companies such as Adtranz and Wismut GmbH, and there is a table showing details of all twelve of the Adtranz locos.

The next section tells the story of proposed rebuilding projects by the DR and DB AG for classes 130, 131, 232, and 234 which did not come to fruition. Among these was a plan for a single cab Class 234 to work both long distance and local passenger services in push-pull mode with driving trailers.

'Weitere äußere Details und Unterschiede der Lokomotiven' is a thorough examination of all the many external differences of classes 130/230, 131/231, 132/232, 142, 233, 234 and 241/241.8. Almost a hundred black & white photographs clearly show the detail differences – perfect for modellers.

The final chapter, 'Die Farbgebungen der Lokomotiven bei DR and DB AG', consists of colour photographs showing all the liveries carried from DR to DBAG. Among them is one of 232 100, which was



repainted in two-tone green for a film. Also included is a table giving full details of all the liveries carried by each individual loco.

As expected from this well-known publisher, this is a well-researched and expertly written history of these popular diesel-electric locos, and comes thoroughly recommended to all those with an interest in diesel locos and their development in Germany.

A good knowledge of the German language will be required to get the best from it as it does contain a lot of technical information. However, the wealth of photographs (some 528) more than adequately shows the varied and changing story of this locomotive type and are particularly useful for the modeller. A must for all "Ludmilla" fans!

European Steam in the 1960s

At the end of the 1950s, steam was still the primary motive power on most of the railways in Europe. Diesel and electric traction was already significant in some countries, notably Switzerland, Belgium, and The Netherlands, and becoming increasingly common in places such as West Germany and Austria, but through the 1960s – especially in eastern Europe – it was still possible to see steam locos of all types, on standard and narrow gauges, hauling normal services. By the end of the decade, however, withdrawal was well under way, and many relatively modern machines went for scrap alongside older examples. Fortunately, this period also saw overseas travel start to become more affordable and so an increasing number of British railway enthusiasts went to Europe in search of steam. This book showcases some of the results.

The selection is drawn from the extensive collection of the Online Transport Archive and includes some two hundred and twenty images, all in colour, the great majority never before published. It makes no claim to be comprehensive or even in its coverage. It is essentially a simple photo album, with one or at most two images to the page, so each appears quite large, reproduced as well as the originals will allow. Inevitably some of the images are technically better than others, due either to the age of the negative or slide or the quality of the camera and lens, and a few have been presented just a bit larger than the image quality really merits. A couple have been enlarged and placed across the page join, which jars. Most seem to have been

taken in reasonably good weather (film was not as fast in those days to cope well with poorer light), but even in sunlight black locos do not make the best subjects! And bright light brings its own problems of contrast and deep shadow.

While steam locos are naturally the centre of attention, these are not all simple roster shots – there is lots of incidental detail for the modeller to observe and absorb. Remember this was before zoom lenses enabled locos to be closely observed from a distance.

The pictures are accompanied by long and detailed captions, most dated to month and year if not more specifically, with a lot of background information on the history, routes, and loco classes.

There are a few minor typographical errors and the occasional mistake – for example, the loco in the lower photo on p.156 is clearly not as described.

Several photographers are represented, most not well known in British railway circles: Paul de Beer, Neil Davenport, Marcus Eavis, Charles Firminger, Les Folkard, Bernard Harrison, Roy Hobbs, Frank Hunt, Harry Luff, John McCann, Geoffrey Morant, Alan Murray-Rust, Phil Tatt, Geoffrey Tribe, and John Worley (in alphabetical order); some are responsible for just a few photos, others for quite a number. Some seem to have travelled widely, others have more limited experience — or particular interests. Some clearly travelled in organised groups, so some of the photos show special trains, but most record everyday activity.

The areas featured are:

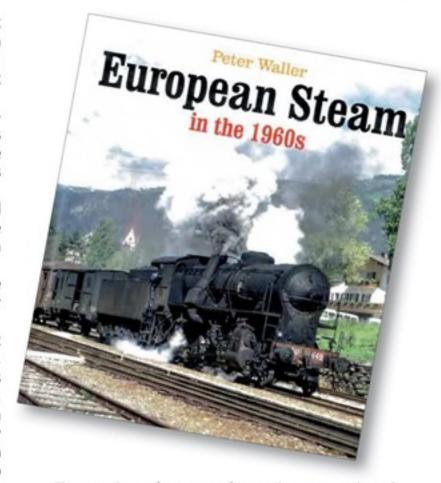
Scandinavia – Denmark, Finland, Norway, Sweden. British Isles – Great Britain, Ireland, Isle of Man.

France and Benelux – Belgium, France, Luxemburg, The Netherlands.

Central Europe – West Germany, Austria, Switzerland.

Eastern Europe – Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, East Germany, Hungary, Poland, Romania.

The Iberian Peninsula – Portugal, Spain. Italy and the Balkans – Greece, Italy, Yugoslavia. More or less north to south, by a roundabout route!



The number of pictures for each area, and each country, varies considerably. In some ways the collection is reminiscent of photo albums from the 1970s and 1980s, with a few photos of many different locations/subjects.

As noted in the introduction, all the images are from the OTA, a charity set up to preserve and make available to researchers and publishers photo collections from enthusiasts; proceeds from the book will go to support its work, a commendable aim, while its very existence may encourage other enthusiasts to deposit their collections for posterity.

The photos are augmented with the occasional ticket, timetable brochure, or period advertisement.

As much a trip back in time as a journey across the continent, this is a wonderful reminder of a lost era.

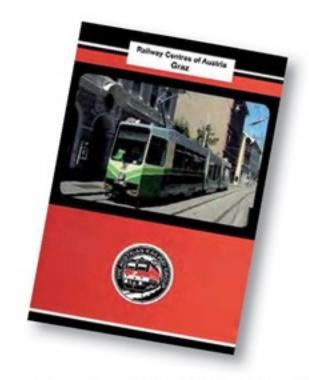
New to the range of publications from the Austrian Railway Group is a guide to Graz in the 'Railway Centres of Austria' series.

The work begins with advice on travelling to the region and planning rail journeys in Austria before offering a summary of the history of the city and surrounding area. The development of the railways serving the city is explained and the current routes explored. The still independent Graz Köflacher Bahn (GKB) naturally features prominently (with a long section on locos and stock, not forgetting the buses) alongside the lines which are now operated by the ÖBB, the Südbahn and the Steierische Ostbahn. There is a separate section devoted to the history of the Hauptbahnhof.

The Koralmbahn project to link Graz to Klagenfurt via major new tunnel (under construction) is also mentioned, and the industrial Andritzer Schleppbahn is not forgotten.

While the railways through and around the city get most attention, the city tramways are also covered, along with the museum dedicated to them.

We also discover the Lieboch railway technical museum, and local specialities such as the Schlossberg funicular and lift, the Märchenbahn, and the Pflalzberg Feldbahn, plus the miniature line of the Dampfbahnclub Graz. The coverage is rounded off with a brief look at available models and the layout of the local model railway club.



There is useful tourist information, in the form of the sights which might appeal other than those of railway interest!

The book concludes with a page with information about the ARG and the group's other publications.

The account is illustrated with colour photos by various ARG members, most from the past few years, plus some archive black & white images. The standard of reproduction is good. There are several computer-drawn maps, not of the highest resolution but quite adequate, and some route schematics from official sources.

The page layout is straightforward and without frills. Note that the contents list has the wrong page numbers between 67 and 87.

Once again, the ARG has produced an informative and interesting guide: anyone contemplating a visit is recommended to read this first to aid planning, and take it along for reference.

This issue is not dated, but the reports cover up to September 2019.

There are twenty pages presenting brief news items from all over Germany, including the Döllnitzbahn, Mansfelder Bergwerksbahn, Mecklenburgische Bäderbahn Molli, Museumsbahn Schönheide, Wim Pater's private collection, Sodabahn Stassfurt, Parkeisenbahn Plauen, Preßnitztalbahn, Rügensche Bäderbahn, Sächsische Dampfeisenbahngesellschaft (Fichtelberg, Lößnitzgrund, and Weißeritztal), Schwarzbachbahn, and the Stiftung Deutsche Kleinbahn at Klutz, plus six pages devoted to news from the Harz.

The Austrian section occupies six pages, and encompasses reports from the Achenseebahn, Bregenzerwald, Taurachbahn, and the Pinzgauer Lokalbahn (SLB), plus twelve pages on the Steyrtalbahn past and present on the occasion of its 125th anniversary, with reports from the jubilee event.

There are no reports from Switzerland in this issue.

The reports have been contributed by several wellknown names (such as Gunter Mackinger and Markus Strässle) augmented by others not so familiar.

There are two longer features, both by the editor.

The lead article describes the slow decline of narrow gauge railways under the Deutsche Reichsbahn, with a lot of tabular information (twenty pages). Many of the lines were closed, but several have survived.

The other substantial article (twelve pages) looks at

This new landscape format album documents the standardised designs of standard gauge passenger coaches (including special types) developed and introduced by the Deutsche Reichsbahn with the aim of attracting passengers with better facilities, more comfort, and faster schedules.

It is in fact a new much expanded and updated version of a book which first appeared in 1988. At that time it was thought that much of the relevant information had been lost in the war, but after German re-unification it slowly became apparent that much had survived in the archives of the DR – and indeed some of the stock had survived quite a long time in the service of the DR – but accessing that information and sorting it did not prove to be a quick process. The author acknowledges that it was very much a collaborative effort, and several of the leading authorities who assisted did not live long enough to see the result.

A short introduction explains how the Deutsche Reichsbahn came into being, initially constituted as effectively a government agency, and how it was soon transformed into a wholly government owned commercial company (the DRG).

The benefits of standardisation had soon become apparent, in the light of the experience of the First World War, even though the German equivalent of a railway clearing house had enabled a degree of inter-operability. Accordingly the DRG embarked upon a wide-ranging programme of standard designs for locomotives, goods wagons, and passenger coaches to replace a varied and often venerable collection of equipment taken over from the independent state railways, with the advantages of economies of scale of construction, the ability to use various suppliers, and the simplification of spares and maintenance, with interchangeability of components. It is perhaps a measure of the quality of the designs (as well as historical circumstances) that these vehicles were

widely distributed throughout Europe and many lasted well into Epoch III, and some even later as service stock.

The book begins with a look at the development of the various coach types, and there is detailed analysis of the amounts and weight of the materials used, down to the types of timber – the financial aspects of construction could not be ignored at this period.

Common components and equipment are then considered, including an interesting analysis of various bogie types. No detail is omitted – from the wheel to the roof ventilators, via the contents of the washrooms!

The main part of the book provides descriptions of the various coach types. For each there is a representative photo (often but not always a works record), a detailed description, and a dimensioned drawing (all reproduced to 1:100) from official records, with side and end elevations, and a plan showing the internal layout.



A comprehensive contents list at the start facilitates reference to specific designs.

The book includes a list of orders, giving year, builder, type, quantity, and running numbers. Mitropa dining and sleeping cars and Post vehicles are included.

The work is illustrated with an excellent collection of historic black & white photographs, well reproduced, and diagrams from the archives. It is rounded off with a list of abbreviations, and the sources and references.

In short, an absolutely essential work of reference for modellers of the German scene.

the Gernrode Harzgerode Eisenbahn four-wheel railcar T1, later DR VT 133 522, now preserved on the Harz system, and recently modelled in HOm by Tillig.

There is also background information about the type RK3 mobile crane (used by the DR for loco coaling) and a detailed review of the new HO kit by Auhagen.

There are four further pages devoted to modelling, reviewing locos and rolling stock from major manufacturers and small specialist suppliers, compiled by Heinz Hofmann. Two pages present reviews of books of narrow gauge interest.

The work is copiously illustrated with black & white and colour photos (one of the latter as early as 1955), all well reproduced on high quality glossy paper.

Presentation is straightforward: there are one or two pictures on each page, with brief but informative captions adjacent. One image forms a double page spread (to introduce the main article).

The strong pictorial element means that even those with little German should be able to enjoy this book.

There are just three pages of advertising for other Endisch publications, and one page previewing the next issue.

As always, an excellent source of information and inspiration for modellers. Warmly recommended.

Loco-Revue Hors Serie 71 MFAO3

This new special from the leading French model railway magazine Loco-Revue, dated February-March 2020, is the third concerned with computer-assisted railway modelling. If that does not appeal, fear not: it is not about the use of a computer as part of a digital control system but is concerned with how a computer can help create particular models of bridges and viaducts, producing components from computer drawings and designs by numeric milling, by cutting with a plotter or laser, and by 3D-printing. The role of simulations to check a design or concept is also briefly mentioned. The only potentially relevant technique which might have been expected to be featured is the use of a computer drawing program to make the artwork for etching metal.

The first section (eighteen pages) considers the wide variety of bridges and viaducts found on French railways, some typical and some very specific.

The general principles of the three computer based ways of producing parts are then explained (twelve pages) before individual examples are described.

Five very distinctive and different models are featured in some detail, some using combinations of the production methods, and we follow them from prototype inspiration through design and drawing, production of parts, assembly, and setting in a scene. All the parts are shown in diagrammatic form, and in some cases the drawing files are available from the LR Modélisme on-line shop.

Four of the five are by François Fouger (one with the collaboration of the book's editor), the other by Jean-Pierre Schenfele. The features occupy between six and twelve pages.



The presentation is clear and straightforward, with restrained use of different fonts and colours for the chapter titles and subheadings. There are occasional tinted panels with details of suppliers of the materials mentioned, and a few points of interest highlighted on orange circles.

The photos are all in colour and well reproduced, mostly large, on good quality glossy paper. They are augmented with a number of explanatory diagrams, especially drawn for the book, plus some old plans and drawings.

This is an interesting collection, with projects that could be followed exactly or inspire an approach to another situation.

A reasonable grasp of French will be needed to get full benefit.

The book includes just two pages of advertisements for other LR Presse publications.

Modelling the New South Wales Railways Budd Rail Diesel Cars

This interesting and informative booklet is a development of a background study for a workshop at the Modelling the Railways of New South Wales convention in 2018. For over forty years there have been occasional articles in the Australian model railway press on adapting models of American Budd RDCs to represent the five railcars built under licence by Comeng in Australia for the New South Wales Railways in 1960-1961. However, the NSW Budd cars were different in almost every respect from the American originals - they were shorter, lower, and narrower, with longer roof blisters, more rounded ends, gangway connections, and deeper windows. In fact, very few parts of an American RDC can be used for the NSW variant, as the author demonstrates. He describes his models as a five hundred piece jigsaw, and most of the pieces have to be scratchbuilt before they can be put together! This booklet provides the plans, templates, dimensions, and procedures for making accurate models of all three types. These are no simple and speedy conversions of proprietary products that are close enough. The process will take time and patience, though there is nothing inherently difficult about it - and certainly not with a guide of this calibre.

The book takes us through the tools required and provides a list of materials before proceeding methodically with the actual work, in convenient sections: the sides, the roof, the cab ends, sprung corridor connections, the roof blister, detailing, the underframe (powered and unpowered), underframe detail, the skirts, glazing (using polycarbonate sheet, to overcome the various failings of both injection moulded and vacuum-formed 'flush' glazing), adjustable coupler mounts, bogies, three-point suspension, interiors, and painting and decals.

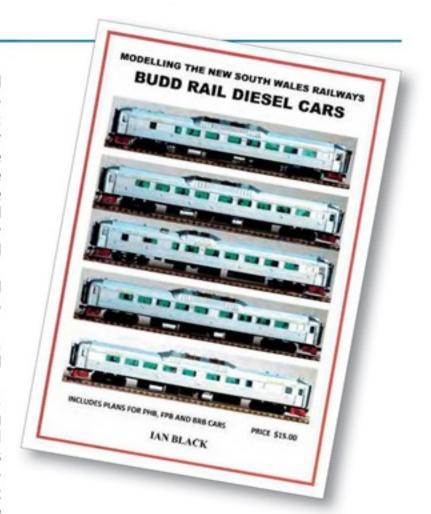
All this is based on real experience and illustrated with examples of the author's work – this is no theoretical treatise but a very practical guide.

While much of the information is very specific, some of the techniques developed by the author and explained here could have wider applications.

This booklet, like the author's previous publications, clearly demonstrates that even with the ever-increasing quality and detail of ready-to-run models, there is still scope for individual creativity improving older models to match, adding specific detail, ameliorating compromises, correcting errors, and creating variants not (yet) offered by commercial suppliers – it is likely there will always be gaps in the range which it would not be cost effective to fill.

The presentation is simple and straightforward, without use of colour, fancy fonts, or graphic devices. The photographs are all in colour, and reproduced well, generally just inserted at the appropriate point in the text at a sensible size.

The material is supported with excellent plans and line diagrams (part templates, etc.), reproduced actual size and fully dimensioned to assist modelling.



The work concludes with references to relevant books, magazines, and websites.

The booklet is available in model and specialist book shops in New South Wales and Victoria.

The main topic of this DVD is the Class 152 electrics in service with both DB Cargo and Germany's private rail operators. Coverage begins with scenes filmed from the lineside of DB Cargo 152s on a variety of different freight services. Siemens 'Dispolok'-liveried examples are also shown, as well as one belonging to ITL. At Seelze DB Cargo 152 025-0 is seen departing the yard with a heavy mixed goods.

At Nürnberg Rbf. depot, where all DB Cargo 152s are allocated, we see examples on shed, including 152 004-8, which is later seen being turned

on the turntable. The loco carries the earlier Railion lettering on the bodysides. Further scenes are filmed from inside the cab of a 152, plus freights filmed from the lineside. Double-headed 152s are seen on a container train and another pairing is seen at the head of a train of bogie hopper wagons.

We next see 152 023-8 being shunted into the workshops for a general overhaul. 152 006 is seen undergoing an overhaul inside the works. Also seen here is the silver-liveried 152 041-1 with 'PORSCHE' lettering. Further 152s are seen at the head of freights, including 152 035-2 passing through Rüdesheim. Also observed is 152 007-1 in the Rhine Valley and an ITL-owned unit is seen in the 'CAPTRAIN' livery.

The next subject is a visit to the narrow gauge (900mm) railway on the North Sea island of Borkum. A Schöma diesel is observed, and then visiting steam loco 99 331 from the Molli is seen in the workshops. The loco is then seen moving off shed and coupling up to its train from Borkum Bf. to Borkum Reede. We also see this loco being delivered to the line on a low-loader lorry, and there is footage from the lineside and from the air of 99 331 with a passenger train en route to Borkum Reede.

The next section takes a look at the Bombardier-built electric multiple units of classes 442 and 1442 at work with DB Regio and other operators. At Trier Hbf. DB Regio 442 001 is seen departing and then inside the Bombardier plant at Hennigsdorf a 442 for DB Regio is seen being lowered onto its bogies. At Halle (Saale) 1442 661 is seen on an S-Bahn working in the silver livery with green passenger doors. Other members of this class are seen at Elster (Elbe) station and in Leipzig. An Abellio-owned 442 is then seen, filmed from the lineside, followed by one operated by National Express in Wuppertal.

Next there is film of MAN railbuses. KEG VT 2.17 is seen arriving and departing with a local passenger service at Luckenow station. Archive black & white and then colour film then shows these vehicles in service. At Gottenheim we see passengers changing from a Deutsche Bundesbahn (DB) V100-hauled train of Silverfish coaches onto a waiting MAN two-car railbus operated by SWEG, with 'Jägermeister' advertising. Further scenes of this train were filmed from the lineside. Another KEG MAN railbus is then shown from the lineside, passed by a Bordeaux red Deutsche Reichsbahn 155 electric on a freight. KEG VT2.15 is then shown on the Unstrutbahn in Thüringia with some shots from inside the driver's cab. A red-liveried MAN railbus is also shown operating on the Hamburger Hafenbahn.

In the *Erinnerungen* section we see film of preserved DR 2-8-4 tank loco 65 1049-9 on passenger services, including some scenes in the snow. We see the crew on the footplate, with further scenes from the lineside at the head of a train of DR green & cream Halberstadt coaches. Another passenger service is seen formed of two DR green-liveried suburban coaches.

Among the subjects covered in the Bahn News section are the enthusiasts' specials hauled by Krupp-built Pacific 01 118 and the special run over the Gotthardbahn in Switzerland in October 2019 using three preserved SBB 'Crocodile' Ce6/8 electrics.

In the final Rückblick section archive colour film shows a DB steam-powered rail crane being used in the repair of a railway bridge.

A certain amount of background music is used on this production, but it is not too intrusive and mainly restricted to the archive material.

Trailers for other DVDs from Eisenbahn Kurier Verlag last for about five minutes.

In the Bonus section, Video-Kurier 71 is featured which includes: 'Farewell to steam in the Thüringer Wald', 'The return to scheduled service of the Ferkeltaxe', 'The new high-speed line from Ingolstadt to Nürnberg', 'Memories of 01 137', and a look back at the Class 03 Pacifics in scheduled service with DB.

Verkehrsknoten Wuppertal einst & jetzt

Wuppertal has been connected to the railway network since the middle of the 19th century. Its main station building at the Hauptbahnhof dates from 1848 and is one of the oldest in Germany. Around 40,000 passengers use around 1,000 trains which make a halt here every day. However, perhaps the most famous landmark of this city is its Schwebebahn, a suspended monorail hanging above the streets and the river Wupper. Camera teams have recorded the railways in and around Wuppertal and archive material from past decades is also

shown. A visit to the Bergischen Straßenbahn-Museum

(tram museum) is also included.

The programme begins with scenes shot from inside the driver's cab of a Schwebebahn car, with further scenes filmed from the street. At Wuppertal-Oberbarmen station we see trains on the standard gauge railway network with DB Regio class 1440 electric multiple units on regional passenger services, and a DB Fernverkehr ICE is also seen passing through.

Next we look at Wuppertal Hbf. and the arrival and departure of an ICE bound for Köln Hbf. Further local passenger services are seen arriving and departing, including some worked by DB Regio 1440s, including 1440 810-8 on a train to Mönchengladbach. Also seen is a Class 146 electric on a double-deck IC service and a DB Regio train formed of double-deck stock is seen behind 111 191. Archive colour film from the 1990s taken here shows preserved DB steam loco 042 241-0 departing the station with an enthusiasts' special, and a couple of 143 electrics are shown working local passenger services. At Wuppertal-Steinbeck station a class 420 e.m.u. is seen arriving and departing on an S-Bahn service, with further film of these trains filmed from the lineside. At Wuppertal-Zoologischer Garten station preserved DB 4-6-4T 78 468 is seen passing through with another enthusiasts' special, with further footage filmed from the lineside.

Back to the present day we see new rolling stock on the Schwebebahn. At Wuppertal-Vohwinkel station we watch passengers boarding the light blue-liveried train and then it departs, with further scenes filmed from street level and from inside the cab. Archive colour film then shows the 1970s-built orange & blue-liveried vehicles at Wuppertal-Oberbarmen. The driver and passengers are interviewed and asked if they could imagine Wuppertal without its Schwebebahn.

This is followed by further archive material, this time in black & white from the 1950s, including trams. Scenes from the 1960s follow, showing the then new rolling stock. We then see colour film of the so-called *Kaiserwagen*, a preserved two-car unit, including scenes from inside the cab. At Wuppertal-Vohwinkel we take a glimpse inside the workshops as the *Kaiserwagen* is brought to a halt. Further scenes show vehicles from the 1970s in service filmed from the streets and from inside the cars.

Archive black & white film then shows Wuppertal trams, followed by colour film from 1964, including the last day in service of the metre gauge vehicles. A recent visit to the Bergischen Straßenbahn-Museum shows the vast collection of preserved trams on display and giving rides to visitors.

We then see an archive DB colour film of the opening of the S8 S-Bahn line, including views of Class 111 electrics in orange & pebble grey livery with matching coaches. Thirty years on and National Express Talent 2 units are seen on local passenger services at Wuppertal-Oberbarmen station. Eurobahn FLIRT type e.m.u.s are also observed, as well as a DB Regio Class 111 hauling a rake of double-deck stock. At Barmen the station building is shown from the outside and then an Abellio e.m.u. is seen arriving and departing with a service to Wuppertal Hbf. S7 and S8 S-Bahn services are also seen being worked by 1440 e.m.u.s with further scenes filmed from the lineside. At Wuppertal-Zoologischer Garten station a DB Regio 422 is seen arriving and departing, with further 1440s on S8 S-Bahn services. Two freights are also seen here, one being hauled by a DB Cargo 185 electric, the other by a Siemens Vectron.

The programme closes with aerial views of the container terminal at Wuppertal-Langerfeld, and ICE and IC services passing through Wuppertal-Steinbeck, including one IC train hauled by a 101 electric and another formed of double-deck stock with a 146, and further views of the *Schwebebahn*.

The commentary, only in German, is clearly delivered and informative. There is some background music, but it is not too intrusive.

The DVD is rounded off with approximately five minutes of trailers for other programmes in the Eisenbahn Kurier series.

Coastal ports are indispensable when it comes to the import and export of goods, and for Germany those situated on the Baltic coast are among the most important. This programme visits the ports at Kiel, Lübeck, Puttgarden, Rostock, Sassnitz, and Mukran. Whether now by containers or still in railway wagons it shows the variety of operations. Broad gauge locomotives are seen at Mukran, where Russian wagons arrive by ferry, along with both old and new shunting locomotives at the quayside. Historical scenes

are also shown of train ferries.

The programme begins with colour footage from the present day showing Kiel harbour. We see the railways here and trains of tank wagons awaiting departure. At Suchsdorf station we see the arrival and departure of a DB Regio Class 648 diesel railcar bound for Kiel Hbf. This is followed by scenes at the container terminal at Kiel where we witness the transfer of containers using the overhead crane.

A visit is then made to the main station, Kiel Hbf. The terminus is seen from outside and inside, and an ICE 3 unit is seen arriving. The new overall roof is clearly shown before we are treated to archive colour film from the 1970s showing passenger services being worked by Deutsche Bundesbahn Class 218 and Class 220 diesel-hydraulic locomotives. Back to the present day and a Twindexx electric unit is seen departing Kiel Hbf. Over at the dockside DB Cargo Voith Gravita diesel-hydraulic 261 077-2 is seen on a train of low-loaders carrying lorry trailers belonging to LKW Walter.

Moving to the ferry port of Puttgarden on the island of Fehmarn, a BR605 ICE diesel unit is seen arriving and departing the terminus, and then film shot from inside the cab shows it moving onto the train ferry for the crossing to Rødby in Denmark. Archive colour film from the 1960s follows, showing the then newly opened Vogelfluglinie (bird's flight line). The terminus station is shown with a variety of passenger and freight services in the hands of DB diesel locomotives of classes V65, V100, and V200.1.

Aerial views then show Lübeck docks and some of the now disused dockside railways. Archive black & white film is also shown of ships being loaded and unloaded at the quayside. Back to the present and the Rangierbahnhof (shunting yard) is shown with further DB Cargo Voith Gravita class 261s observed on mixed goods trains, including 261 098-8 and 261 035-0. An NRS ex-Deutsche Reichsbahn V100 B-B diesel-hydraulic, V100 04, is also shown leaving on a train of low-loader wagons with LKW Walter trailers.

In the Main Valley a class 185 electric is seen from the lineside on another working with LKW Walter trailers. Further trains conveying this type of freight are also seen

Archive colour film taken at Wismar shows ex-DB class 221 diesel-hydraulics being unloaded from a ship on their return from Greece.

At the port of Warnemünde archive colour film of the docks area includes a DR four-car VT18 diesel unit inching its way onto the train ferry. Another passenger service is seen here, formed of DR double-deck coaches with a DR V180 diesel-hydraulic. More recent colour film shows another train of DR double-deck stock being propelled by a DR 243 electric in original Bordeaux red livery.

Back to the present day and at Warnemünde Werft station we see the departure of a local passenger service worked by a DB Regio electric unit. Aerial views of Rostock follow, showing the docks and its four terminals. Coal wagons are shown and ex-DR electric 114 703-2 in Bordeaux red is shown stabled in a siding. HSL Logistik's ex-DB 0-6-0 diesel-hydraulic 363 121-5 is seen running light, and later this loco is noted shunting. Archive colour film of the docks at Rostock shows ships at the quayside and a DR V60 0-8-0 shunter on a train of banana vans. The container depot is also shown, including a train of containers behind a V180. Film from the present day then shows lots of abandoned lines in the dock area, including further aerial views. Railion diesel 298 377-7 is shown on yet another train of LKW Walter trailers at the container terminal, and a similar working is seen arriving behind 363 121-5. 298 377-7 is then observed departing. Later this train is seen being worked by a DB Cargo class 145 electric, and Erfurter Bahn Service 142 110-6 in Bordeaux red is seen running light and then filmed from the lineside on a train of bogie tank wagons.

We then move on to the port of Sassnitz with archive colour film of the arrival of a ferry from Denmark. The ship's bow doors are opened and wagons are seen being shunted onto the ferry by an orange DR class 346 0-8-0 diesel shunter. At Sassnitz today a DB Regio FLIRT electric unit is seen departing on a local passenger service. The station still has semaphore signals.

This is followed by archive colour film of the port of Mukran, showing ships and various DR shunting locomotives at work. Trains are seen being moved onto ferries, with further scenes inside a signal box. Wagons are shown having the bogies exchanged. Present day footage shows disused sidings and lines of abandoned DB locos, units, and coaches, including classes 140, 151, 155, 232, 290, and 628.

Commentary, which is only in German, is both clear and informative. There is a certain amount of background music used, mainly during the aerial footage and towards the close, but it is not too intrusive. Around five minutes of trailers for other Eisenbahn Kurier DVDs follow this programme.

The SBB class Ce6/8 electrics, nicknamed 'Crocodiles', are known throughout the world. From 1919 to 1922 a total of 46 were placed into service, mostly for freight service over the Gotthardbahn. From the 1940s they were extensively modernised and the last one was not withdrawn until 1986. This programme presents historical film of these locos at work, and also shows the preserved examples 13302, 14253, and 14305.

It begins with colour film of 13302, 14253, and 14305 at the head of enthusiasts' specials over the

Gotthardbahn. The oldest, brown-liveried 14253, is seen running light followed by film shot from the driver's cab as it runs on shed at Erstfeld. Other preserved electric locomotives are seen here.

At Göschenen, 14253 is seen again, this time arriving on an enthusiasts' special, with further footage filmed from the lineside. The driver is interviewed and he tells us all about 14253. Further scenes of this loco follow, filmed from the lineside and from inside the cab. Later we see the loco moving out of the shed at Erstfeld.

Further specials are then seen behind 14305 in green livery, filmed from the lineside.

Back at Erstfeld 14253 is seen coupling up to a 'Red Arrow' railcar and later we watch this combination filmed from the lineside.

At Glarus station 13302 is also seen.

Next archive black & white film from 1957 shows services over the Gotthardbahn, including car carrying trains. Old colour film from the late 1960s is also shown, with a brown Ce6/8 at the head of a heavy freight filmed from the lineside, including scenes

filmed from a road vehicle running parallel to the railway. Further examples are seen in green livery, including film from inside the cab. The locos are also seen shunting, and one is seen at a railway event at Würzburg in Germany, being shunted by Deutsche Bundesbahn Köf 323 781. 14267 is seen at Speyer in Germany, and in München Austrian ÖBB 'Crocodile' 1189.09 is spotted. Further footage shows these locos in service with ÖBB, including orange 1189.02.

Back in Switzerland, 14253 is seen again, filmed from the lineside on a train of green bogie coaches. Archive colour film from the 1970s follows this with scenes of Ce6/8 locomotives at the head of passenger trains on the Gotthardbahn, filmed from the lineside and from inside the cab. More recent colour material shows others on shed and at the head of specials as well as scheduled passenger and freight services. The metre gauge Rhätische Bahn 'Baby Crocodile' No.415 is also shown on a mixed train.

At Berlin-Wannsee station 14305 is seen on its way to a railway event in Sweden at the tail end of a passenger train hauled by Rail Adventure's ex-DB class 103 electric in two-tone grey. This is followed by further film of Ce6/8s on specials. We see 13302 in October 2019 on a two-coach passenger service at Cham station. Another special is shown with an SBB Re4/4 and a Ce6/8 at its head.

The programme closes with scenes filmed at Erstfeld on 19th October 2019: we see 14305 and 13302 being coupled up to Seetal small 'Crocodile' 15303 and the three preserved machines are then seen departing at the head of a ten coach special, with all whistles blowing.

Commentary, only in German, is both clear and informative.

There is a certain amount of background music used, but it is not too intrusive.

Around five minutes of trailers for other Eisenbahn Kurier DVDs follow the programme.

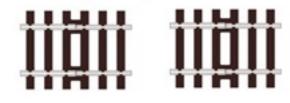


Peco Spring Report highlights

The Peco programme announced at the Nürnberg trade fair in the Spring Report includes an important new development in the American code 70 range – large radius #8 Unifrog right and left hand turnouts, with a frog angle of 7.15° and a nominal radius of 1,702mm.

The previously announced #6 Unifrog turnouts (nominal radius 1,092mm, frog angle 9.5°) should soon be available.

The Streamline code 100 range will be expanded with new small radius curved turnouts, also using the Unifrog, with a frog angle of 11.25° and 438mm/505mm radii.



There will be short transition tracks to connect Code 70 to Code 83, and Code 83 to Code 100.

There is to be a new Setrack start set for O gauge featuring second radius curves (1,028mm): the pack will include sixteen 22½° ST-725 curves, five ST-700 standard straight (each 394mm long), one ST-U751 left hand turnout

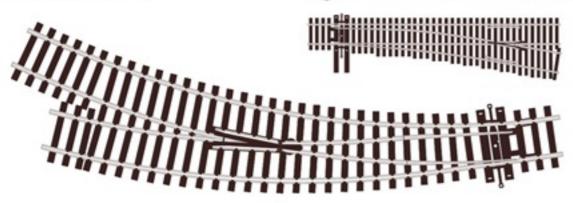


(Unifrog), and on SL-740BH rail-built buffer stop.

The selection of photographic scenic backgrounds will be increased with three new images: ref.SKP-02 Plain Sky, ref.SKP-03 Sky and Clouds, and ref. SKP-04 Countryside Landscape.

Each consists of three 800mm by 320mm sheets that can be used individually or joined together seamlessly.







Australian Railway Models to be launched with NSW C38 Pacific

Southern Model Supplies, who distribute Peco products (among several other major brands) in Australia, are starting a new venture under the name of Australian Railway Models.

Their first project, revealed at the recent toy fair in Melbourne, will be a ready-to-run HO model of the iconic New South Wales C38 class express passenger 4-6-2, an Australian classic.

These Pacifics were commissioned by the New South Wales Government Railways to eliminate the expense and complications of double-heading heavy express passenger and mail trains on the demanding Main Southern line between Sydney and the Victorian border at Albury. Designed and built in Australia, the first of thirty appeared in January 1943. The first five were built with a streamlined cladding.

The first model release will be a non-streamlined machine, numbered 3806 (ref.87001). This is completely new



tooling. It will feature separately applied body detail parts, a detailed cab interior including floating footplate, accurately reproduced motion, a dual position drawbar for tender close coupling, and authentic knuckle couplers. It will be DCC ready.

The streamlined variant is planned for later production. Perhaps most remarkably, the anticipated price is A\$299.00, more typical of ready-to-run diesels for this market – most of the available steam models cost rather more.

It should be available in August/

September, and we hope to review a sample in due course.

More motor upgrade kits for N from Tramfabriek



Arnold Köf II

The famous Köf II diesel shunter is a popular model. The smallest Tramfabriek motor, the 6 x 15mm, is ideal as a replacement as it not only makes the model run wonderfully but also takes less space, which means a decoder can easily be fitted - or you can see through the cab from front to the back for the first time! Another first: the motor comes with a worm fitted, so there is no need to remove the worm from the old motor. Just cut and re-solder the wires; no glue needed, close the model and it is done. The power of this little 12V motor is impressive, but if you use the freed space to add more weight it can be even stronger.





Minitrix V160 and BR216

There are also 12V coreless motor upgrades for models made from the 1970s until early 2000. If you have one of these models, remove the body to see which frame it is.

These motor upgrades deliver superior running and a much quieter drive. Extensive step-by-step text and photo instructions should make the conversion

The conversion may also be suitable for other Minitrix B-B models.

Finally, also new is a simple brass adaptor 5mm long. For some projects this is an essential component to solve a technical issue. It fits on the shaft of the 7 x 16 and 8 x 16 motors so a worm with an inner diameter of 2mm can be used.

New Rhätische Bahn container wagons for Nm from AB-Modell

Under the brand Die Güterbahn, the Rhätische Bahn transports a wide variety of products on its network. This includes containers and swap bodies, which have replaced the classic general goods in recent years. In addition to vehicles specially created for the transport of standard containers, since 1997 the RhB has modified a series of old four-wheel wagons and fitted holding pins to their still useful chassis to make them suitable for swap bodies. These wagons are numbered Lb-v 7857 - 7881.

The swap bodies can be loaded and unloaded directly from a ramp, or transferred to a lorry by crane or mobile forklift. Final distribution usually takes place by road.

AB-Modell announced this model in 2019 to be released at the end of the year in several variants. Difficulties with obtaining Minitrix containers put this back, so to avoid further delay a first series is now available with swap bodies for Swiss Post, cargo domino, and three Co-op refrigerator containers.

A second series will then follow - at a time not yet known - of the outstanding containers, with the Volg motifs and Co-op refrigerators with orange and salad motifs.

A total of eight different models and eleven different numbers offer the possibility of attractive train consists.

The new models roll smoothly on metal wheelsets in bushes by Lok-



Schlosserei. The load is equipped with a magnet to hold the swap bodies on the wagon, which is equipped with Micro-Trains couplings.

These wagons are exactly to 1:160, can only be used on 6.5mm gauge track.

The swap bodies are mostly from proprietary sources (Fleischmann, Minitrix,

and Creanorm) and these bespoke versions are available only while stocks last.

The ÖBB and later NÖVOG bicycle vans were modified so often that an unusual method has been used to model them. The basic van has no markings and the customer can choose one of several accessory packs to complete the model's identity. These add-on kits are free when obtained in combination with the van (priced at €90.00) but are also sold separately to allow prototypical representation of existing models. The nickel-silver plates are printed directly with a UV printer and have a very nice presence.

BORHT appoints new President

Dr Michael Bailey has accepted an invitation to become President of the British Overseas Railways Historical Trust (BORHT). Dr Bailey was the Chairman of the Trust at the time of its Mode Wheel museum and tourist railway project at Manchester, and put in a great deal of work to organise that project and gain credibility for the Trust. When Mode Wheel was lost to Peel Holdings, he looked at a couple of other possible locations including Vulcan Foundry, without success.

Dr Bailey is an expert on Robert Stephenson and has done a number of pioneering archaeological investigations of early steam locomotives. He was awarded a D.Phil by the Railway Studies Institute at York. He was created M.B.E. in 2010 for his services to industrial archaeology.

Dr Bailey's appointment was in time for the 35th anniversary of BORHT's incorporation on 9th November 2019, when he gave a presentation to a joint meeting of BORHT and the Stephenson Locomotive Society on "British-built Steam Locomotives Down Under".

BORHT celebrates 35 years

The British Overseas Railways Historical Trust (BORHT) was 35 years old on 9th November 2019. BORHT was incorporated in 1984 for the purpose of establishing a museum to tell the story of our railway export industry. This was to be at Britannia Park. Although this did not eventuate, over 35 years BORHT has built up a library and archive which has become a respected historical resource used by researchers from all over the world. The library and archive are at Greenwich, but they are looking for larger accommodation, preferably with space for a museum.

BORHT publish The British Overseas Railways Journal, devoted to the export railway trade in all its aspects from hardware to people.

The 35th anniversary was celebrated with a joint meeting with the Stephenson Locomotive Society at which our new President, Dr Michael Bailey, gave an illustrated talk on "British-built Steam Locomotives Down Under" and Dr Oliver Owen and Seun Ajagunna gave a presentation on "Research and Restoration in Nigerian Railways".

A recent project by a BORHT team has been writing the 400 page book British Military Railways Overseas in the Great War (published by Mainline & Maritime), which covers all theatres where British troops built and/or operated railways in the 1914-19 War.

BORHT has helped a number of organisations to repatriate British-built locomotives from abroad, including the Pakistan SPS class 4-4-0 and South African GL class 4-8-2+2-8-4 Garratt at the Manchester Museum of Science and Industry (MOSI), as well as the Sentinel steam railcar at Quainton Road; BORHT also owns a 60cm gauge four-wheeled diesel.

By 1960 diesel and electric traction was replacing steam, particularly in Belgium, the Netherlands and Switzerland – but in other countries such as



Austria, Britain, East and West Germany, Spain and Portugal, it was still possible to see many of the most impressive steam engines hard at work on both passenger and freight traffic. By the end of the decade however, many of these iconic locomotives were taken out of service. In some countries withdrawn locomotives were retained as a strategic reserve in case of emergency but in other countries, most notably Britain and France, vast numbers of relatively modern steam locomotives made their final journey to the scrapyard.

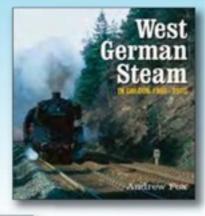
