with January being a traditional announcement time for Hornby Hobbies.

There must be something in the air this time though, as Dapol revealed plans for two new Great Western Railway steam locomotives - the Churchward 'Mogul' and Collett '5101' 2-6-2T - in the final weeks of December adding further to the excitement of Hornby's announcements which were due to take place on January 8.

Proudly we are able to bring you full coverage of Hornby's 2018 catalogue in this issue with a dedicated six pages of news covering all the information and new 'OO' gauge product details that you need to know.

The headlines are three new steam locomotives - the Maunsell 'Lord Nelson' 4-6-0, Holmes 'J36' 0-6-0 and LMS streamlined 'Princess Coronation' - along

with a Maunsell Kitchen First and a pair of LNER 'Toad' 20ton brakevans. Of course there is a list of reliveries covering steam, diesel, electric, carriages and wagons together with an increase in the range of Twin Track Sound decoders being made available as separate items.

Picking a highlight from all of this is always going to be swayed by regional interests - suffice to say that we can't wait to see the finished results from all of these product announcements - although, just maybe, I might have my eyes set more on the 'Lord Nelson' with my Southern leanings.

Modifying Oxford's 'Radial' Layout plannin

Hornby reveals SCOTTISH, SOU MIDLANDSTEA

HREE NEW STEAM LOCOMOTIVES are headlining Hornby's 2018 catalogue launch covering subjects from the Scottish, Southern and London Midland regions offering a diverse portfolio.

New for the year ahead, and currently in development, are the North British Railway (NBR) Holmes 'J36' 0-6-0, the Southern Railway (SR) Maunsell 'Lord Nelson' 4-6-0 and the London Midland & Scottish Railway (LMS) streamlined 'Princess Coronation' 4-6-2. They are to be joined by a selection of 14 further steam locomotive reliveries using Hornby's extensive catalogue of ready-to-run motive power.

The 'J36' is Hornby's first all new ready-to-run Scottish outline locomotive since introduction of the Gresley 'D49' 4-4-0 in the 1980s. The fleet of 168 J36s', originally NBR 'C' class, was designed by Matthew Holmes in 1888. The class was mainly built at Cowlairs Works, but was later rebuilt under the direction of Reid - Holmes' replacement as Locomotive Superintendent at the NBR - from 1913. The first 108

were completed by 1920, but it took until the mid-1920s following the grouping for all to be rebuilt.

Some of the early rebuilds were requisitioned to work in France for the Railway Operating Division in the First World War, departing in 1917 and returning in 1919 following which they received names of

famous battles, Allied commanders and fictional characters

The class continued in service through LNER ownership and 123 went on into BR service following nationalisation of the railways in 1948. Six survived in service in Scotland until 1966 with the final two being withdrawn in 1967. One

- 673 Maude - has been preserved. Hornby's new model will cover the 'J36s' following rebuilding by Reid with three being selected for the first year. Haig in BR black with early crests (R3622). All will feature a tender mounted 8-pin DCC decoder socket, locomotive mounted motor, sprung buffers and NEM coupling pockets.. Release is anticipated in the third quarter of 2018.

THE'NELSON'

Joining Hornby's already extensive range of Southern Railway designed and operated motive power is the imposing Maunsell'Lord Nelson' 4-6-0. Billed as the most powerful steam express locomotive in Britain by the Southern Railway at its introduction in 1926, the class featured a unique eightcylinder exhaust beat due to the arrangement of the four-cylinder motion. They were a development of the Maunsell 'King Arthur' class designed to maximise the potential of the 4-6-0 chassis on the Southern Region.

On release to traffic, the fleet of 16 locomotives was used on the Western Section operating from Nine Elms shed where they could be found on the routes to Bournemouth, Portsmouth and

Exeter. Later they were allocated to Battersea shed from where they were trialled on Dover boat trains.

A number of modifications were made to the class during their careers including the addition of smoke deflectors, chimney design, bogie frames and cylinders. Most were paired with 5,000gallon bogie tenders, but they could also be seen with modified Urie 'S15' style 5,000gallon tenders as well as 4,000gallon six-wheel tenders.

The first was withdrawn in 1961 with the last bowing out of main line service in October 1962. One has been preserved: National Collection owned 30850 *Lord Nelson* which is currently under overhaul at the Mid Hants Railway.

The all-new Hornby 'Lord Nelson' will include the ability to model early and late locomotives including those with original chimneys

as well as later Bulleid modified designs. Planned for release in the first year are 851 *Sir Francis Drake* in Southern Railway olive green without smoke deflectors and with its original chimney (R3634) together with 30850 *Lord Nelson* in BR lined green with late crests, smoke deflectors, Bulleid chimney and a high sided tender with Twin Track Sound (R3600TTS), and 30863 *Lord Rodney* in BR lined green with early crests, a high sided tender and Bulleid style chimney (R3635).

Release is expected in the second quarter of 2018 with the first engineering sample having been received by Hornby during late 2017. As with the 'J36', the 'Nelsons' will have a tender mounted 8-pin DCC decoder socket, provision for installation of a speaker in the tender chassis, a locomotive mounted five-pole motor, NEM

coupling pockets, sprung buffers and turned metal wheels.

STREAMLINED 'CORONATION'

The attention grabbing LMS streamlined 'Princess Coronation' 4-6-2s have been selected for release in 2018 as a follow up to Hornby's 2017 launched 'Duchess' 4-6-2s (HM125). The new streamlined version will use the same chassis as the newly released conventional locomotive, but with an all new body.

The streamlined locomotives were introduced in 1937 to haul the LMS's high profile expresses on the West Coast Main Line. 6220 Coronation also went on to set a speed record of 114mph on June 29 1937, although this was soon eclipsed by the LNER's record run with Gresley 'A4' 4-6-2 4468 Mallard in July 1938.

The Hornby 'J36' is progressing through the design process. This is the first stereo





UPDATE

The first batch of locomotives, 6220-6224, were turned out in LMS Caledonian Blue with silver stripes which was matched by three sets of specially turned out Stanier Period III carriages for the 'Coronation Scot' train service. These were followed by five further locomotives, 6225-6229, which were delivered in LMS crimson lake with gold lining. The final batch of streamlined 'Coronations', 6235-6248, were built with draughting modifications.

The class ultimately lost its streamlined casing in the late 1940s leading to a more conventional appearance for the class which they retained until withdrawal in the 1960s.

Hornby's new model incorporates options for single and double chimney locomotives in the brand new tooling for these high profile locomotives. In addition each model will be supplied with full size and undersize pony truck wheels – the latter to allow them to be operated on second radius curves while modelling the full front valance around the bufferbeam and cylinders together with an 8-pin DCC decoder socket, space for a 28mm round speaker, sprung buffers and a powerful five-pole motor.

The first releases will be 6221 Queen Elizabeth in LMS Caledonian Blue with silver stripes (R3623), 6244 King George VI in LMS crimson lake with gold lining (R3639) and 6229 Duchess of Hamilton in LMS crimson lake with gold lining in original condition (R3677). Delivery is expected in the fourth quarter of 2018.

SUPPORTING CAST

Together with the brand new locomotives, Hornby is serving up a selection of reliveries on its existing

product range including new versions of the GWR'Castle' 4-6-0, SECR'H'0-4-4T, Bulleid'West Country', 'Battle of Britain' and 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s as well as 'Royal Scots', 'A4s' and a pair of new Peckett'W4'0-4-0STs. To mark the 50th anniversary of the end of BR main line steam operations a special train pack is being released to model train 1T57 – the final special operated on August 11 1968 and hauled by BR'Britannia' 4-6-2 70013 *Oliver Cromwell*. The pack will contain

70013, a BR Mk 1 Brake Second Open in BR maroon and a pair of Mk 1 Tourist Open Second in BR blue and grey plus a 1T57 headboard for optional fitting to the 'Britannia'.

Multiple units lead 2018 DIESELAND COLASE DIECTRIC RANGE

LECTRIC POWER is at the head of Hornby's new introductions for 2018 with the return of the 'Brighton Belle' five-car Electric Multiple Unit (EMU) as well as new versions of the 2017 range Class 87 and Class 800.

The 'Brighton Belle' is making its return to the range, as exclusively revealed in HM125, and will be produced in late-1960s Pullman livery with later crests and small yellow warning panels on the unit ends. It will be presented as unit 3053, but will now be released in separate packs for the driving and trailer cars (Cat Nos. R3606/R4871).

It will feature interior lighting powered from the track in each coach together with NEM couplings between cars and a single 8-pin decoder socket to operate the full unit.

The soon to be released Class 800 Intercity Express Programme (IEP) unit is due for a second outing in 2018 as unit 800003 *Queen Elizabeth* in GWR green livery and, as per the 5-BEL, it will be issued as separate packs for driving and centre cars (R3609/R4870). Features include interior and exterior lighting and a pair of 8-pin decoders will be required for conversion to digital operation.

The two five-car units are being joined by new versions of the Class 43 HST power cars, Class 50, 60, 67 and 87 during the year in a modest collection of diesel and electric locomotives.

The Maunsell Kitchen First was introduced in 1926 with 20 being built to Diagram 2651 for operation on services from London to Bournemouth, Portsmouth and Exeter. They ran on 8ft bogies and used standard 59ft underframes.

Hornby's new model covers the Diagram 2651 vehicles and will initially be released in Southern

previously released Maunsell corridor stock by Hornby. The models will feature turned metal wheels, NEM coupling pockets and small tension lock couplings.

Joining the Kitchen First is a range of 56 further vehicles delving into Hornby's extensive roster. It includes Maunsell rebuilt 58ft ex-LSWR stock in Southern Railway olive green, BR Southern Region green Maunsell corridor stock,

Heading the wagon range are new models of the LNER'Toad' 20ton brake van encompassing both the 'B' and 'E' versions, the first of which were introduced in 1924. These LNER brake vans took the best of the Great Northern and North Eastern railway types and amalgamated them into a new group standard design. 710'Toad B' vans were built between 1924 and 1929 while 901 'Toad E' vans were constructed between 1929 and 1935.

Hornby's new models will convey the build differences between the Diagram 034 ('B') and Diagram

DATED ERA SYSTEM UNVEILED



Hornby has unveiled an updated Era system in its 2018 catalogue and Hornby Magazine will be adopting it as a new medium to illustrate the period in which locomotives and rolling stock operated.

The new Era system extends to 11 different periods by breaking down the complex privatisation section into the three divisions while also adjusting the date ranges of earlier


The new sections cover Network







DAVEWESTWOOD drew inspiration from childhood daytrips to create this wonderful pastiche of Cotswold railways in 'N' gauge.





HE WESTERN REGION of the 1960s was a rapidly changing place and, while the same was true throughout the British Railways network, the Western still had its own way. The splendid Churchward and Collett designed Great Western Railway 4-6-0s were still a daily sight amongst 'Panniers', 'Prairies', 'Moguls' and heavy freight 2-8-0s.


However, what made it truly different alongside the copper capped chimneys, four-digit steam locomotive numbers and polished brass cabside numbers, was the arrival of the diesel-hydraulics. No other area of the British railway network operated this form of traction and they gained a following all of their own. These have just begun to arrive at Marsh Chipping.

The home of the Western Region was undoubtedly London Paddington - the gateway to the Great Western Main Line which linked the capital with Bristol, South Wales and the clean sweet air of the Cornish Riviera. Main line activity was intense on this route, but beyond there were many secondary routes which possessed a more rural atmosphere and it is this that Marsh Chipping aims to model, at a location in the Cotswolds.

It is a Friday afternoon in June 1962. You are returning to Worcester after spending a week attending a course in London. It was quite intensive and involved working late into the evening and you are feeling weary. The sun is warm through the carriage window making you drowsy, and somewhere north of Oxford you nod off. The train suddenly slowing down causes you to open your eyes and become aware of passing through a station whose nameboard says Marsh Chipping. You drift off back to sleep thinking: "That's strange - I don't remember that on the way going...'

Marsh Chipping is, of course, a fiction, but born out of my love of the Cotswolds because of many days out there as a child. I was brought up on the southern edge of the Black Country and day trips to places like Chipping Campden, Broadway, Stowon-the-Wold and Bourton-on-the-Water were quite common. The picturesque villages with their honey coloured stone buildings left a lasting impression. When I was planning this layout, I decided not to model anywhere too specific, but to try >>>





and give a flavour of the area. In the end I settled on a variation of the track plan of Chipping Campden, with an added branch to give a bit of variety to train movements, with the goods shed and overbridges borrowed from Moreton-in-Marsh.

The layout is made up of two 4ft x 2ft 6in baseboards with two more 1ft 6in x 2ft 6in boards attached by hinges at each end. These fold up and the two halves are bolted together to form a box for transportation. The baseboards are made from 50mm Celotex expanded insulation foam with a softwood frame, which makes for a light but very sturdy construction. This has stood up to the rigours of seven years of exhibitions so far with no problems. When erected, the main boards are held together by 8mm bolts and sit on adjustable metal trestles. The ends have their own separate legs also with built in adjusters.

INVESTING IN DETAIL

Although I find all aspects of modelling satisfying, the part that gives me the most pleasure is creating the scenery. Blocks of polystyrene are shaped with a hot wire cutter, fixed down with adhesive and covered with filler coloured with dark brown wood dye. This means that any knocks or scrapes don't show up as white and any missed areas of scatter look like bare earth. Scenic materials are from Woodland Scenics, Javis and Heki. The trees are created mainly from Woodland Scenics fine leaf foliage but also include some using wire armatures and a few ready-made which have had a repaint and additional foliage added. The scrubby undergrowth and hedges are a base of lichen with a combination of fine and coarse scatters fixed in place with spray on glue and sealed with hairspray. The amount of

greenery is regularly commented on (there are more than 100 trees) but as far as I am concerned you can't have enough trees.

It is important to remember that not all the people attending exhibitions are necessarily railway enthusiasts, so I always include several small cameo scenes to bring a little humour and life into what some might see as just watching the trains go around. Amongst these on Marsh Chipping are a painter working on the station fencing being distracted by a young lady, a runaway horse nearly causing an accident, a goat eating the flowers in someone's front garden and a family out walking their dog. When these are commented on at exhibitions it is very pleasing that they have been noticed and appreciated.

One of the other things always mentioned at exhibitions are the Cotswold stone buildings. A visitor spent several minutes >>>



at one exhibition deciding which one they would like to live in! They are from S D Mouldings and I first saw them some years ago on Andy Calvert's Nether Stowey layout and was immediately taken with them. I built a whole village of them on my previous layout Claydon (HM7), but unfortunately, as far as I know, they are no longer being produced, although they can occasionally be found on internet auction sites.

The station building is a resin casting from Timecast Models, as are the huts. The platform bases and overbridges are from the excellent Scalescenes range of download and print kits. The goods shed is a scratchbuilt version of the original one at Moreton-in-Marsh and is constructed of card from cereal boxes. My main concern was how to represent the wooden cladding on the sides of the building. In the end I opted to use thin styrene strips individually glued on, only to be informed after I had




completed it that the exact type of cladding I needed was available in sheet form.

TRACK AND CONTROL


Track and points are Peco code 55 on the viewing side and code 80 in the storage yard. Viewing side points are operated by wire-in-tube connected to mini slider switches which also change frog polarity. Hidden yard points are electrically operated via a diode matrix for route setting. Ballast is genuine granite, washed to remove dust and fixed by the usual 50:50 PVA and water mix. Rails are painted with rust colour and ballast finished with a wash of sleeper grime. Weathering powders are then used to highlight various areas, such as where locomotives would stand.

Operation is standard analogue with three controllers. One is for the up line, one for the down and one for the branch – the latter can also be switched

to control either up or down lines using a simple cab control system.

The majority of the locomotives and rolling stock are from the usual suppliers and have been weathered and detailed where necessary, but special thanks must go to Hugh Griffiths, a fellow Syston Model Railway Society member, who has built several locomotives for me. They are the '28XX' 2-8-0, '72XX' 2-8-2T, '42XX' 2-8-0T and a '73XX' 2-6-0 - their quality is superb. He is one of my regular operators and sometimes brings along what he calls his 'funnies' for a bit of a run. These include GT3, Fell locomotive 10100, Brown Boveri gas turbine 18000, 0-10-0 Lickey banking engine 58100, and the never built Riddles designed 2-8-2, which eventually became the BR Standard '9F' 2-10-0. It may not be very prototypical, but they are a bit of fun and always cause comment and in some cases complete bewilderment.

I would like to thank all the people who have helped operate Marsh Chipping at exhibitions, especially John Malpus, who got me started in the first place, Mike Collins for introducing me to a diode matrix and other things electronic, Hugh Griffiths for his exquisite locomotives, Eric Beech and Chris Leach for stepping into the breech at the last minute and Gary Tabener, whose first exhibition meant driving to Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

Marsh Chipping is a regular on the exhibition circuit and we all thoroughly enjoy operating the layout to entertain the public. If you see us at an exhibition, please come and have a chat, because while building and exhibiting gives a great deal of satisfaction, talking to fellow modellers or would-be modellers is also a pleasure. We are very approachable and always ready to discuss all things railway, answer questions and hear your ideas.



TABLING SIDINGS and marshalling yards play an important role in the efficient operation of the railway, providing somewhere to stable locomotives, rolling stock and multiple units between duties.


They come in all shapes and forms from modest engineers' sidings to sprawling marshalling yards with dozens of tracks, and sometimes filled with a vast array of wagons or carriages. Today, many of the yards that remain in use on the network are used primarily for staging freight or engineering trains, although some are increasingly used to store redundant or withdrawn rolling stock. Although somewhat rarer these days, shunting operations do still take place at some locations. In their heyday, there would have been much frantic activity with locomotives, shunting personnel and an eclectic mix of wagons being formed into multiple train formations ready for their onward journeys.

With recent trips involving journeys skirting the expansive yards at Bescot, Thornaby and Newcastle, my thoughts have turned to recreating a marshalling yard in model form which would effectively double as a scenic storage yard, offering plenty of operating potential and a means to keep rolling stock stored on the layout without interrupting the flow of other trains. Few of us will really have the space to model a marshalling yard in full, but we can certainly aim for the flavour. For further operating potential, it was important that the yard be incorporated into a larger scheme with four main lines passing through, together with a locomotive servicing facility and a large station too, providing added purpose and that sense of a busy location.

THE PLAN

Located in the West Midlands during the 1980s and '90s, our scheme's 16ft x 8ft 'OO' gauge footprint requires a fair bit of space and would ideally suit a loft space or garage and consists of two Up and two Down continuous loop main lines offering scope to keep four trains running simultaneously, while shunting operations can be undertaken within the yards in the lower half of the plan.

Utilising Peco code 75 track throughout, the diagram comprises 36 turnouts, including 19 medium radius (Cat No. SL-E195/SL-E196), nine double-slip crossings (SL-E190), five curved double-radius points (SL-E186), two long crossings (SL-E194), a single large 'Y' >>>



turnout (SL-E198) and just under 80 lengths of flexible wooden sleeper track (SL-100F).

Working from the top, the upper section of the plan incorporates a large station with two main platforms, an up and a down bay platform and provision for parcels trains with a simple locomotive run-round facility too. As well as the platform faces, two through lines are also included, enabling freight trains to operate unhindered, while a simple crossing to the right of the station allows arriving Diesel Multiple Units (DMUs) to switch between platforms. Incidentally, the main option for crossing between circuits is through the complex series of double-slip turnouts in the lower half of the plan, which provides access to all lines and the yards from either direction for maximum flexibility. Whilst perhaps not ideal for main line running, the double-slip



crossings do serve as useful space savers.

With an east/west split of the sidings, the lower right-hand fan of four sidings offers limited run-round facilities, while the series of five terminating lines to the left provides additional storage options with both sets linked by two pairs of double-slips, enabling further run-round options and the ability to shunt vehicles without

the need to access the main lines. Additional lines could be added if space allows while a short stub siding is also included for stabling shunting locomotives or train engines that don't require servicing. Across the junction complex, a small servicing facility and stabling point is provided for locomotive maintenance and refuelling duties – again adding to the operational interest.

ROLLING STOCK

Given the layout's suggested 1980s/1990s theme, a wide selection of suitable 'OO' gauge modern-era motive power and rolling stock is available from the main manufacturers and could include BR Classes 08, 20, 25, 26, 27, 31, 33, 37, 40, 45, 46, 47, 50, 56, 58 together with a good roster of DMUs such as Classes 101, 108, 110, 121, 122, 150, 153 and 158. Other signature models include Hornby's InterCity 125 High Speed Train, BR Mk 1, Mk 2, Mk 2D-F and Mk 3 carriages, as well as a wide-ranging collection of wagons. You could also include overhead electrification, with an increasing variety of suitable motive power including Bachmann's Class 85, Heljan's Class 86 and Hornby's soon to be released newly-tooled Class 87 AC electric locomotives, while Bachmann's 'OO' Class 90 is also edging closer to production.

Amongst the 'OO' gauge ready-to-run rolling stock highlights are BDA bogie bolster wagons, 'Polybulk' bulk grain hopper wagons, FNA Nuclear flask wagons, HAA coal hoppers, HEA/HSA/HTA hopper wagons, KWA/KWB 'Warwells', OBA opens, OTA timber carriers, PCA bulk powder tanks, 100ton TEA bogie and 45ton TTA tankers and many more. Factor in a good selection of 'Dogfish', 'Grampus', 'Seacow', 'Sealion', 'Tope', 'Clam' and 'Rudd' engineers' wagons and you have the makings of an exciting layout with plenty of opportunity for main line running and shunting activities.

Operations could include a mix of locomotivehauled and multiple unit passenger services interspersed with a diverse range of freight services from simple trip freights comprising a handful of wagons to longer Speedlink formations and lengthy bulk freights of aggregates, cement, coal and fuel oil. With some services recessing in the sidings, while others are reformed ready for their onward journey, there would be plenty to keep you occupied.


Whilst this scheme assumes operation during the 1980s and 1990s, it could also be backdated accordingly or even set in the present day, especially now that an impressive selection of post-privatisation motive power and rolling stock is also available, including recent Class 143, 144 and 156 DMU releases from Realtrack Models.


Finally, with Bachmann and Hornby's respective Scenecraft and Skaledale ranges of ready-to-plant buildings, populating the scheme with appropriate structures is easier than ever before with a good selection of depot buildings, footbridges, fuelling points, houses, mess rooms, shops, signalboxes, station buildings and much more to further enhance the layout.

STEP BY STEP PAINTING STONE BUILDINGS IN 'OO'

FTER TAKING A SHORT BREAK from the building of the compact Loch Dhu layout, work restarted on both the distillery buildings and yard scene in a determined push to complete the layout by the end of 2017. Autumn 2017 saw the main structures completed and adjusted so they would fit together and the surrounding pavements of worn and dirty concrete were also well established.

The time for painting the structures had finally arrived. The maltings, kiln house, wash house (low relief building) and office were ready for the job of making them look as if they are constructed of stone and slate rather than sheet styrene! Painting of the buildings was completed, together with weathering before glazing, window bars and other details were fitted to the models. The task was made easier by assembling the distillery buildings as several modules instead of one large structure - individual buildings are easier to handle for painting and adding small details.

A second structure was to be painted and that is the skewed overbridge which makes up a scenic break for the distillery yard scene. It is constructed of plain and embossed styrene where the embossed stonework was cut into 'blocks' and fitted to the styrene core as if they were laid as stone courses. The style of construction is different to the distillery buildings and is of granite blocks rather than sandstone. It was to be painted in a mid grey colour with certain blocks of stone picked out in iron oxide hues before weathering with soot, smoke and dirt.

CHOOSING THE STONE

I selected South Eastern Finecast random stone as the closest fit for the distillery buildings, knowing that a considerable amount of work

would have to be put into achieving a pleasing weathered stone effect. Slate roofing also came from South Eastern Finecast and Slaters embossed slate roofing material was used.

Much of the inspiration for my distillery buildings came from the preserved Dallas Dhu distillery near Forres in Morayshire which has some lovely warm stone colours in its walls. The warm reds, browns and orange shades are the result of iron oxide in the structure of the stone which leaches on to the surface giving the stone its warm colour. Iron oxide staining can take the form of many different shades from dark brown, red, yellow, orange, and tan colours depending on the type of rock and where it has been quarried.

A little cross-fertilisation of ideas and techniques led me to explore paint sets intended for other uses such as the Lifecolor Rust and Dust acrylic paint set together with Weathered Wood. I also selected some colours from the Tamiva paint range. Soot and mould colours came from the Lifecolour Black, Rubber Shades & Co. set which has six useful shades of black ranging from dark grey to very dark grey.

MOULDY WALLS

Also known as 'warehouse staining fungus' or 'Angels' Share Fungus', Baudoinia compniacensis is the black mould commonly found staining the walls of distillery structures.

The mould covers everything including adjacent buildings, warehouses (not modelled), trees, walls, and even stored casks themselves. Its ability to withstand extremes of temperature and other climatic conditions allows it to colonise structure walls and roofs where its presence is purely cosmetic.

Some buildings that are not cleaned may be repointed as time passes, resulting in very clean mortar lines between black stone blocks. This black mould is significant to my stone colouring project and finding a way to dirty up the buildings for Loch Dhu without completely covering any underlying stone colours without making the scene look too dull and dirty was going to be an interesting challenge. For that, I looked at colours from Lifecolor and the use of an airbrush.

PAINTING THE BUILDINGS

There is no doubt that selecting and mixing the right colours is the biggest challenge. Once happy with my choice, the process was very simple. I used a variety of flat paint brushes and a stippling brush to apply an iron oxide mix almost >>>

randomly of browns, tans and greys to a base coat of Tamiya Deck Tan. The paints were diluted, and some blending was done too. Individual stone blocks were 'painted' in place whilst in other areas, the colouring was more general.

The overbridge, having discrete stone blocks, was easier to complete by painting individual stone blocks in slightly different rust browns in as random a fashion as possible. The arch and lining were of brick, so these were given a coat of light brick red before being treated with some mortar colour. In common with the distillery buildings, the staining colours were applied thinned to the model to create a hint of colour which was built up in layers rather than applying the staining in a single shot of paint. The colouring effects are subtler as a result.

Soot and grime, not to mention an alcoholic black mould with a taste for fine whisky, was to have a major impact on my buildings. One of the difficulties was trying to introduce some newish mortar work between the stones. This eluded me thanks to the random nature of the embossed styrene card.

Very thin washes of Dirty Black and Worn Black from the Lifecolor paint set were used to start toning down the stone. Thankfully, both flat Tamiya paint and Lifecolor paints dry with a good flat finish making them ideal for stone and slate. The washes were thinned to a ratio of 6:1 and even as thin as 10:1 and were allowed to run into all the relief applied to the buildings and the overbridge.

The final task involved the use of an airbrush,

one capable of handling the coarser texture of acrylic paint. I tried both a Sparmax and an Expo branded airbrush with success the effect of black mould being applied to areas of the buildings using Lifecolor Deep Cockpit, thinned about 4:1 with Lifecolor acrylic thinner. The final effect was startling and yet I managed to avoid covering my original stone colouring and achieved an interesting weathered effect to the buildings.

With the buildings suitably coloured and weathered, they may now be finished with important details such as windows, the pagoda top to the kiln house, wall braces, doors, sliding door runners, window bars, external lights and signage. One thing I do not wish to do is add too much detail – sometimes less is more.

STEP BY STEP PAINTING STONE BUILDINGS IN 'OO'



One option for the overbridge located at one end of the distillery scene was to scribe the underlying plain styrene base to represent stone courses before progressing to additional layers.



Stonework on the bridge was made up of pieces or blocks of stone cut from South Eastern Finecast Random Stone sheet (FBS416) which can be made to look like dressed granite stone construction.



The basic structure of the arch bridge takes shape with the dressed stone completed by applying filler to some areas to introduce some variation. The structure was in the process of being shaped to fit the corner location when this photograph was taken.



Having completed the core structural modelling of the buildings, they were cleaned and undercoated with Tamiya Deck Tan (XF-55).



Achieving complete coverage with the base stone colour is not essential depending on how light you wish your stonework to be.



The challenge is to make plastic look like stone with a dull finish and rust colouring common to stonework. Lifecolor Rust and Dust provided many of the colours needed for Loch Dhu distillery for the underlying 'clean stone' colours.



Some experimentation with browns from the Weathered Wood paint set by Lifecolor was undertaken with success. Note the mixing tray being used to create a range of different rusty brown shades.



Applying blocks of staining iron oxide colour to create stonework effects using a flat brush. As the mixing dish shows, a wide variety of subtle shades can be mixed with thinner to make the stone colours as random as possible.




A wash of dilute Dirty Black starts the process of weathering down the buildings.



Work in progress: the main distillery structure was built as severa separate buildings to make handling and finishing easier. Note the contrast in those finished with a thin wash of Dirty Black and the one in 'clean' stone at the far end.



The roofs of the buildings are coated with a solid coat of grey. Some texture will be added with different shades of grey being used to pick out individual slates.





The variation in the basic underlying stone colour between the individual buildings is deliberate – stone from any quarry will also vary depending on which bed and face it is being extracted. Rock formations also vary in colour over distance.



Moving to the exchange siding, the stone needed weathering with rusting from the bridge beams and algae resulting from damp and running water. Tamiya XF-58 Olive Green is an ideal colour for algae staining on stonework.














HE LAST 18 MONTHS have produced two models of the London & South Western Railway (LSWR) '0415'4-4-2T. Oxford Diecast was first past the post with its model (HM102) which had shortcomings as the front bogie took weight off the driving wheels and on the slightest uneven track slipped to a stop. A similar fault also appeared to a lesser extent with the Hornby model (HM110).

The second batch from Oxford had corrected the front bogie problem but failed to alter the lesser problem with the trailing radial axle, which also took weight off the driving wheels on anything but dead flat track. This type of problem can adversely affect the haulage capacity of a small locomotive in a dramatic way and it isn't the first time we have seen this type of problem with a ready-to-run product. Happily, with simple techniques, these problems can be resolved making for a reliable locomotive.

The Oxford 'Radial tank' can easily be dealt with

without major tools. Stage one is to carefully remove the keeper plate to the trailing axle. Underneath is a plastic assembly which holds the phosphorus bronze pick-up in place. With it removed, the wheelset can be lifted out. There are two brass sprung electrical connectors which contact the pick-up assembly. Carefully remove these and then remove two tiny springs located in holes in the axle bearing. These are extremely small and can easily be lost - I did just that but Oxford Rail was kind enough to sell me a replacement set.

The bearing for the axle needs to be deepened by approximately 1mm to accommodate the modifications outlined in the step by step guide. I marked the chassis and would have used a round file of the correct diameter, if available, to deepen the axle guide. The alternative was to use a dentist bit of the correct diameter in a minidrill to grind away the axle bearing to the depth marked on the chassis. It was a bit crude, but it worked and with a careful smoothing of the bearing with my tapered file, the job was finished – if you aren't comfortable

with using a minidrill for this job, a file will work too but will take longer. The whole assembly was put back together, and the pick-ups tested for contact.

I dislike couplings that stick out beyond the buffers as there is no reason for this where layouts have a minimum of 2ft 6in radius curves. This meant that shortening the tension lock coupling was my next job. The rear coupling was easy - the NEM socket was shortened as was the tongue of the plug in tension lock. It was also replaced with a Bachmann coupling as they have the shortest hook and thinnest bar.

The front bogie was rather different. It was completely disassembled and a large chunk of the moulding containing the NEM socket removed with a combination of mini saw and cutting bit, finishing off with a file. A cut down Bachmann coupling was then glued and bolted with a 12BA nut and bolt and checked for height. The beauty of tension lock couplings is that they are not so critical on height as other types such as Kadees. I aim for a 1mm clearance above the track for the bottom of the uncoupling bar but space of up to 1.5mm is acceptable.


I added weight by cutting two circles of lead and gluing them into the smokebox and stuck two pieces to the underside of the chassis where they could not be seen. I also dropped small pieces into the space under the coal and ran glue in to hold them in position.

Now for the increased performance. Before I carried out this work, the model had slipped on a 1-in-45 gradient with two new Hornby LSWR suburban coaches. They weighed approximately 150g per coach. I managed to remove the weights with some difficulty and this removed 150g on a three-coach load. After my modifications, the locomotive was happy with three LSWR non-corridor coaches and a heavier kit-built hospital coach at 130g, therefore hauling a load of 430g.

Table 1 shows the results. The tractive effort is measured by hauling wagons loaded with lead up a 1-in-45 gradient with a gauge between the locomotive and wagons. Lead is added until the model slips, and the measurement noted.

A coach takes a tractive effort of between 4g and 6g on the gradient. The volts and amps are recorded at the level that the locomotive wheels will start slipping when pushing against the buffers, a useful figure to have as a check against in the future if the locomotive is underperforming. I also set a maximum voltage to run each locomotive with analogue controllers so that a sensible top speed is not exceeded. I record the speed at several voltages.


The adjustments and changes to the Oxford Adams 'Radial' have greatly improved its position in the fleet for my garden railway, but the same benefits will come for indoors layouts too. The real boon is that I can now rely on this locomotive to operate as I want it to through a couple of evenings of detail adjustment.





To extend the depth of the rear axle slot I used a dentist bit in a mini drill to remove additional metal. If you prefer a round file can be used, but it will take longer.



After clearing the bearing with the dentist bit, it requires cleaning up with a round tapered file to smooth any rough edges.






Rebuilding starts by replacing the springs and electrical connection studs together with the rear axle.



The radial axle and pick-up assembly are then fixed back into position and secured in place with their original screw. The axle is pushed over as far as it goes in each direction to check that the pick-up remains in contact.

Driver's eye view

HE ENQUIRY OFFICE IN HM127 featured the camera wagon that you've used plus the recently-introduced Branor wagon. My main hobby is photography and I've always had a hankering to get a track-level view of my layout so attached are pictures of my latest camera wagon.

I bought the 'action' camera on the internet and it is tubular with a variety of clamps for attaching to a helmet or other fixtures. The button on the top switches the camera on and off so I needed to keep it accessible. The wagon is a long wheelbase Hornby LMS CCT.

The van body detaches in one piece, so I cut the roof off and glued the rest of the body (less one end) back onto the chassis. Two pieces of brass were glued to the chassis to form a cradle for the camera then I glued an endplate and an aluminium clip onto the underside of the roof. The clip is a



friction fit on the van sides and also engages with two indents in the camera body so holding the whole thing secure and upright. The rough plastic edges need tidying up, but the concept works and the van looks right in a train. I've left the couplings at the front and rear so that I can add the

wagon to the back of a freight train and film the wagons snaking along in front of it. The pictures are quite good although these 'action' cameras work best in daylight so aren't quite so good in tunnels.

Unfortunately, this particular camera has the microphone at the back, so the predominant sound is the clattering of the wagon over points and rail joints. All I need to do now is improve the scenery on my layout so that I've got something worth filming.

LOCO TO TENDER SHORT CIRCUIT FORUM

I have a Hornby model of Gresley 'A4' 4-6-2 4468 Mallard (Cat No. R2784) which is DCC fitted. It ran fine going forward but always caused a short circuit when run in reverse. I assumed it was because of the drawbar connection and the small wiper blades that sit under the tender. I thought that if maybe I removed that power connection to the tender and replaced it with a plug and socket connection I could solve the problem.

I spent a good hour doing exactly that and proudly put the outfit on the rails to test it. It ran fine forwards and worked until I reversed back into the siding. For the life of me I cannot see how there can be a short as I've removed the drawbar connections. Has anyone else had this sort of problem? *Hornby forum user mikejj101*

- Do you have a different tender you can attach albeit just for testing purposes?

- Generally, it is the twin springy finger thing shorting on the tender post but as you have bypassed this with a plug we should be able to rule that out. Did you also disconnect the wires both at the drawbar and at the tender post when you did the conversion? I presume you don't have a cross-connected locomotive and tender because the short

would occur as soon as you connected the two together. Check continuity from locomotive and tender wheels t just to be sure.

■ The secret was in the darkened room bit! Without the tender the engine would reverse slowly until it hit the points and then in a darkened room I can see that the front bogie is actually hitting the connecting rods and sparking. Providing the engine is going fast enough this doesn't actually short out. When I attach the tender I obviously run it slower through the points and hence it shorts and stops RailMaster with a short circuit.

REALISTIC DRIVING EXPLAINED

Sutton's Locomotive Workshop (SLW) noted with interest Philip Wallington's letter in the December 2017 issue (HM126), requesting advice on the operation of sound effects available on DCC sound-equipped locomotives and the correct sequence.

For the SLW Class 24 diesel we compiled a 52-page instruction booklet (available to download free of charge at www.sulzertype2. com) that includes much useful information on how, and when, to initiate certain sounds.

After spending a lot of time consulting with ex-British Rail engineers and footplate staff, we decided that one of the best ways to describe the correct operation of our sound-fitted model was to put the modeller in the driving seat and describe, first hand, the actions needed in a number of common driving scenarios. These include driver's checks and start-up, coupling up to a train, and braking to a halt at a terminus station.

For example, imagine your driver has 'signed on' for work, read his notices and has been allocated his locomotive for the day. At the shed or stabling point, after finding his locomotive, he must first conduct 'preparation duties' before it can be started-up. These include making a visual inspection, connecting the starting batteries and then undertaking a series of specified checks.

Operating F10 will provide the sound of the exterior BIS (battery isolating switch) panel being accessed, a distant bell ding as the batteries connect and a click as the lighting circuits are switched in. The clatter of the cabinet door being swung closed and locked completes the effect. After opening the cab door (F11 on), then slamming it shut (F11 off), begin the start-up sequence with F12 on. The driver can be heard inserting his key into and unlocking the master controller and opening the cabside window. After the 'clunk' indicating the movement of master handle to the 'engine only' position, the combined pump set would start and run (F13 on) until the lubricating oil pressure was sufficient, usually about one minute. The AWS



system is also activated before cancellation of its warning horn. Switch F13 off and activate F5 before starting the engine with F1. In reality, the pump set would continue to run but this sound would not be heard over the exhaust, and it uses up a valuable sound channel. Using F5 before F1 will initiate a cold, prolonged, start and put the locomotive into 'light engine' mode.

When the engine has fired and reached a steady idle, further procedures would be undertaken. F12 off will play a fire alarm bell test and F14 gives the handbrake wheel being released. Some function buttons will produce one sound when switched on, and a different, but complementary, sound when switched off.

The specific actions of professional railwaymen are difficult enough for the enthusiast to record and copy, especially if you are restricted to the 'wrong' side of the fence. Adding to this, methods of operation have changed dramatically as the railway has been modernised, such as the move from steam to electric traction and use of technology like radio signalling. Preserved railways operate in a similar safe way to the main line railways of the 1960s, so it is often worth a trip out to just watch and note human interaction and see how things are done. We are sure any volunteer driver would be more than



happy to answer questions about their role and why and when they take specific actions. The BTF driver training films (on YouTube or DVD) are also a useful historical resource.






RESERVATION layouts can be somewhat rare, but for me this is what made it appealing. Other older modellers model their childhood memories or the good old days, and for me the Bluebell Railway was my childhood remembering a fair few family days out to the railway for various events, the first of which was in 1998. With younger modellers coming through, I don't think preservation layouts will be too rare in the future, with quite a few cropping up on various model railway forums.

Having gone through various places that I visited when I was young, I finally settled on the Bluebell Railway in 2004. Its amazing collection of rolling stock and locomotives was certainly an attraction for modelling the railway. The more I visited, and the more I looked into the railway, I found I wanted to start railway modelling again as I had not touched my old model railway stock for some time. The Bluebell presented more of a challenge due to the rolling stock as I would have to learn more to achieve what I wanted in terms of kit building - not just rolling stock but locomotives too.

The layout and planning all started back in 2004 and, sticking with 'OO' gauge, the layout was originally built in my bedroom at my family home. It was designed to be shorter to fit everything in meaning platforms were reduced, so instead of seven coaches it would only take three or four. At the time of building I was on a very strict budget, so most of the money went on the baseboards which were constructed with 6mm plywood with pine batons across the boards to brace them. DC control for me was an easy decision. Digital Command Control (DCC) at the time was just coming on to the scene - but having no knowledge of it and how it worked, I stuck with what I knew and what for me worked reliably. Track is now all Peco nickel silver code 100 flexible track with dead frog medium radius points which are powered by Seep point motors.

Planning of the layout took a few months as well as a few research trips to the Bluebell Railway. I settled on Horsted Keynes as the station to model, a nice attractive large country station set in the 1930s Southern Railway era but of course)



in the present day. The reason for this choice is that it is a big station so I could have more than one train arriving or passing each other with a possible third locomotive shunting stock. The large amount of storage sidings at Horsted Keynes meant I could easily store stock on the layout while having room to run trains. The layout was moved from the family home out to the garden shed in 2008/2009, which meant some rebuilding was required but also an opportunity to expand it slightly with the layout finally measuring 11ft 2in x 2ft 2in.

Originally, the layout didn't have the main station building, but after its move this was added in the front of the station plus extra room for storage by adding part of the carriage and wagon workshop. Despite its move, it is a permanent layout in spite several exhibition invitations.

As mentioned before, the layout was built on a strict budget. Old block-board was used for the platforms, A4 Superquick station card kits were used for the buildings although modified using photographs I had taken of the actual buildings. I overlaid these on to the kits to hide the stone print on the originals, which was quite simple and cheap to do. The main station building was a bit of a 'bodge job' and way before Bachmann's excellent Scenecraft London Brighton & South Coast Railway (LBSCR) buildings. It was constructed from two kits, the Will's country station kit and also a Peco country station kit. The canopy was scratchbuilt with 3D printed columns in LBSCR style, the island platforms' canopy has the Hornby die-cast supports which were a good price at the time and have become more popular since.

The signalbox is a special commission by Hornby Magazine which was quite difficult to get hold of. I missed the first batch, but luckily a second batch was released, and I acquired one. The structure was detailed inside using the Springside signalbox kits and illuminated with a small LED. The water columns on the platforms are white metal castings from 5&9 Models which specialises in LBSCR models. Other station furniture like the nameboards were made from match sticks and ice cream sticks. The lights, which have been changed a number of times over the layouts life and which were changed again just before the photographic shoot, are Ratio Southern Railway concrete lamp posts modified with LEDs in the lamp shade. I ended up using small 3mm surface mount LEDs which were pre-wired with 0.3mm wire hidden in a small channel down the post. Everyone will recognise the signals as being from Hornby, but they have been modified and shortened to get them down to a more acceptable height.

THE PRESERVED TRAINS

The locomotive models are a mixture of ready-to-run and kits. To date I have all the Bluebell's locomotives in model form, including the ones not finished yet like the BR '2MT' 2-6-2T and the 'H2' 4-4-2.

One of the better known and probably one of the more popular locomotives is No. 3 *Captain Baxter*. This was one of my first scratchbuilt models which was built upon a Dapol 'Pug' chassis. It came out quite well and was quite popular on the internet forums, so much so that I later designed one for 3D printing not just for other modellers but also because it had a small film role at Pinewood Studios.

Most rolling stock on the layout is readyto-run, using Bachmann Mk 1s and Bulleid coaches along with the excellent Maunsell corridor stock and Pullmans from Homby However, with the Bluebell's extensive rolling stock list, not all are available so some creative thinking is required.

The Bluebell's vintage set of coaches which include the Metropolitan set was quite a recognisable rake and I wanted to recreate this. There is an excellent etched kit from London Road models but there are only three coaches not four, plus it didn't include the brake coach that I





saloon, also totally 3D printed, is on the roster and runs on Hornby Gresley bogies. Most of these coaches feature in the photographs in this very article.

Freight stock is a mixture of Bachmann, Cambrian and Chivers Finelines kits mainly due to the vintage set of wagons and vans that are occasionally in service which are just not available in ready-to-run form.

Even though the layout is nearly 12 years old, I am still adding and changing things on Horsted Keynes to make it look better or add more detail in certain areas, or capture more realism such as correcting the lamp posts. Most recently, I have concentrated time on adding lineside details such as relay boxes, soak away drains and speed boards around the station. I feel this has helped a bit, but of course there is only so far you can go with improvements before you need to rebuild the layout, which is where I am now.


PERSONAL FAVOURITES


In terms of what I run on the layout of course it's easy to look on the Bluebell's website and see what the Bluebell is running, but I have my favourites - as do people that follow the layout on social media. *Captain Baxter* running with pregrouping wagons is a personal favourite for me, as well as probably being one of the first scratchbuilt models I have built.

Of course, having modelled a preserved railway, I have the flexibility to run anything I would like so I am not stuck with one region or one era. With the Bluebell having locomotives in heavy overhaul or a conversion and not even built yet it is possible for me to also run future locomotives, which for me is quite interesting and gives a view of the future. I think one of my more interesting builds was the 'H2', where I purchased cast parts from a well-known auction site, unfortunately missing the chassis and various other small castings.

I always if possible try either finding a readyto-run chassis or the chassis meant for it, but that just wasn't possible, so somewhere in my mind and after much measuring I purchased a Hornby GWR *Hogwarts Castle*. After removing a wheel set and adding a trailing wheel and changing the front bogie to an 'L1' bogie to maximise electrical pick-up, I managed to create a well-running, model with a very good haulage capacity, so I was quite pleased with this model creation... until Bachmann announced its 'H2'!

The future of the layout is a bit uncertain. Living a fair distance away from it means sadly I do not get to use it as much as I would like. There are some small detail changes still to make for station buildings but the age of the layout and the fact that it has suffered in the cold of living in the shed means its fate might be sealed. It will require a big rebuild, to the point where it will probably be easier to build a new layout. However, that could be a long way in the future.











North London Railway Class 75 0-6-0T 58850 simmers in the platform while 'H2' 32424 arrives in the background with a train to Sheffield Park.

STEP BY STEP A GUIDE TO MODEL PAINTING





Above: Preparation is vital. The completed model must be thoroughly deaned and degreased before painting, otherwise you'll get problems such as residual flux deposits causing the paint to bubble. Ordinary domestic cream cleaner from the cupboard under the sink is fine. If you can find it, Barkeeper's Friend (an old-fashioned Vim-like scouring powder) is the one I like to use.



Right: It is often simpler to work on separate parts of a model, rather than the whole in one. This model breaks down into three sections – chassis, bodywork and roof. Only the wheel rims are visible under the tram's side skirts so there's no need to paint any of the frames and mechanism.





" COULD NEVER DO THAT."
I have often heard people say this. Lacking confidence in our abilities, unsure of what's involved, put off by bad experiences in the past - the net result is that often we don't even bother trying. This has never been part of my modelling philosophy, although I'll admit there are some aspects of the hobby that I habitually fight shy of, such as layout wiring, using a multimeter or painting a backscene.

I imagine it's the same for most people - we steer well clear of those areas that (or so we imagine) are beyond us. But what do we gain from not being able to read a circuit diagram, or build working signals? Nothing, is the answer. Fear of failure makes us reluctant to experiment or try new things, even though we need to make mistakes if we're ever to learn anything.

It's not necessarily time or money that holds us back – it's something less tangible such as a general shortage of skills, experience and especially awareness of exactly what's involved. Soldering a kit, using an airbrush, programming a decoder, building your own pointwork - outwardly off-putting, but once you see someone doing it, especially if they explain how it's done, it suddenly seems a lot more attainable. A measure of persistence is involved but these are skills that, once acquired, will last you a lifetime and open up any number of doors for you - the only difficulty is making a start.

In HM123 we looked at detailing and improving a white metal locomotive kit, and in this piece, I want to show you something equally fundamental that many people seem to avoid - the basics of painting a model. This time our subject is one of the famous 'Y6' 0-4-0Ts of the Great Eastern Railway, one of the most charismatic locomotive classes ever to run in this country. But it could just as well have been a brake van or a signalbox - this piece is all about the principles involved rather than the specifics of painting one particular model.

The 'Y6' was built from a Connoisseur Models brass kit, but the same approach would apply to models made from just about any modelling medium. There's nothing special about the tools or materials I'm using either. Some of the work is done by hand, other parts are done with an airbrush – this is how I've always worked. I'm using acrylic and enamel paints quite interchangeably. And yes, you can layer them one on top of the other with no ill effects.


Patience, preparation, discipline and routine are what really matter, not what kind of airbrush you own, or which paint you use – so just sit back and relax while I run through what's involved.

I hope this article makes you feel encouraged to have a go at painting yourself – that's why I've written it and why I'm sharing my experiences with you.



Few people still alive will remember passenger services on the Wisbech & **Upwell Tramway,** which finished in 1927. STEP BY STEP A GUIDE TO MODEL PAINTING



On a conventional locomotive, I'd spray the chassis with satin black car aerosol when all the details are on but before I've added the wheels, motor and brake gear. With the 'Y6' chassis, I simply used a Sharpie marker pen to blacken the wheel rims where they'd be visible under the side skirts.



Turn the parts upside down so the spray can reach areas that haven't received adequate coverage from the first application. Although you don't want any bald patches, it's no problem at all if you can still see brass through the primer. If you give your model a good thick solid coat of primer, you risk obscuring detail through excessive paint build-up.





Make sure the paint itself is fit for purpose. Before any painting session — regardless of whether I'm doing it by hand or with an airbrush, or using acrylics or enamels — I mix my paint for a good two minutes with a battery paint stirrer. This makes all the difference as far as how well it flows and how good the coverage is. A quick five-second whizz with an old paintbrush or the tip of a screwdriver is no use to man nor beast.

Once the interior paint had dried (I allow several days for this important process), I cut up some old business cards to mask off the painted woodwork while I sprayed the boiler and other fittings. The design of the kit is such that the interior detail is permanently fixed in position — this isn't ideal, but sometimes you have to think your way around these little local difficulties.







STEP BY STEP A GUIDE TO MODEL PAINTING






Having removed the masks, I got the 'pub ceiling' effect I wanted on the cream interior woodwork by brushing on some MIG P414 Track Brown powder, followed by a thin layer of MIG Dark Wash (P220) that was allowed to collect in the plank lines. After being off the market for some time, I'm pleased to see that the original MIG weathering products are back on the market under the Abteilung 502 brand, with the same reference numbers as before.





Wherever possible I will undercoat my models using an appropriate colour of paint. This gives you better coverage and deeper, richer tones than if you try and spray the main colour straight off. Tamiya XF24 Dark Grey is great for the roof, the side skirts and the water tank. This last will be painted blue on the finished model. Again, I used an airbrush but on a small model such as this you could do it all by hand.









As a basis for the subtly variegated 'varnished wood' effect I wanted on the exterior bodywork I used acrylic shades from MiG AMMO's Red Primer colour modulation set (7002). This isn't a primer per se, rather it's paint intended to replicate the subtle tonal variations found on military vehicles that have been pressed into service while still in red oxide primer. I reckoned these colours would do just as well as an undercoat for the woodwork.



The Great Eastern painted the tram's buffer beams blue, along with the water tank which was located directly under the floorboards. I masked the side sheets so I could airbrush the latter with Precision Paints GER Blue (P210). The buffer beams were hand-painted using a long-bristled No. 2 brush — it's easier than masking everything up! There's no problem, by the way, about applying enamel paint over acrylic and vice versa — you don't need barrier coats or anything, just don't try and physically mix them.

The roof, meanwhile, has received various airbrushed shades of warm grey-black paint but its final colour will be determined when I ome to weather the locomotive. In point of fact we're almost there with the painting now, and I'll put the model aside for a few days to allow the paint to fully harden. This is as important a part of the process as preparing the model for painting.



The wide range of products available from companies such as Fox Transfers and Cambridge Custom Transfers makes lining easier than you might think. I often make my own by airbrushing a sheet of waterslide transfer paper the exact colour I want and then cutting narrow strips. Once they're in their final position I brush on a coat of Microsol to toughen them up.

Final touches – the transfer lettering and numberplates came from Guilplates. Weathering was mostly to do with a thin dark wash over the bodywork. The platework is Humbrol No. 85 Satin Black overpainted with LifeColor Burned Black (UA729) and then given a bit of metallic sparkle with AK Interactive Dark Steel (AK086).

TIP

Just because acrylics dry in a few minutes doesn't mean they are fully hardened.

Before moving on from primer to top coat and from top coat to weathering always allow the paints to fully harden for at least 24 hours.



Dapol's second 'Bubble' car arrived during December in the form of the Pressed Steel Class 121. MIKE WILD inspects the latest single-car DMU for 'OO' gauge.

ULTIPLE UNITS have clearly been in favour during 2017 for 'OO' with the arrival of the 4-TC, Class 450, Class 156 and, from Dapol alone, the Class 122 and GWR streamlined railcar. Now Dapol has added a third singlecar unit to its roster with the arrival of the Pressed Steel built Class 121 'bubble car'.

The 121 has long been the subject of a 'OO' gauge model through Hornby which used the ex-Lima model to reintroduce the unit to its range in the mid-2000s. Dapol started from the ground up with its Class 121, meaning that it could follow the high specification set out for the Gloucester Class 122 units for the same scale (HM121).

The real units were introduced in 1960 with a total of 16 single car Driving Motor Brake Seconds (DMBS) being built by Pressed Steel, initially for service on the Western Region. In later life the units also operated around London, on the Bedford-Bletchley line and on the Sudbury branch in Suffolk. Their use on the national network came to a close in May 2017 when the final two were withdrawn by Chiltern Railways, which had retained them for service on the Princes Risborough-Aylesbury branch line in Buckinghamshire. Of the original units, five have been preserved.

THE MODEL

For review we had the opportunity to inspect three different versions of Dapol's new 'OO' Class 121: a production model in BR green with small yellow warning panels as W55028 (Cat No. 4D-009-002), Hatton's limited edition original Network SouthEast liveried 55022 (4D-009-HAT07) and DCC Supplies limited edition of Chiltern Railways BR green unit 121034 as it was in service until May 2017 (121034).

The model follows a similar format to that of Dapol's Class 122, consisting of a clip-fitted body over a chassis which contains a centrally-mounted flywheel-driven motor driving both bogies, a 21-pin DCC decoder socket, space for a 20mm round speaker, interior and exterior lighting as





quick and simple to install once we had selected appropriate codes for our BR green sample.

PERFORMANCE

Sharing the same mechanism as the Class 122 model means we know what to expect with the 121 - and our samples didn't disappoint. All operated smoothly and quietly straight from the box and offered excellent slow speed control which allowed them to crawl to a stop at stations. All-wheel pick-up assists in this process together >>>





Bachmann's replication of the intricate GCR lined green livery is outstanding with an exquisite overall paint finish, white/black/ white boiler bands and lining

together with fine red running plate lining – even the locomotive wheels are lined. Closer inspection reveals neatly shaded GCR lettering, printed builder's plates, nameplates and numbers applied to the red bufferbeams, while the cab interior is also well appointed.

A 21-pin DCC decoder socket is located within the semipermanently coupled tender which also houses space for a

Irish cement bubbles

Irish Railway Models (IRM) has released the follow up to its ballast hoppers for the Irish railway scene in a selection of triple packs modelling the cement 'bubble' wagons operated by Coras Iompair Eireann (CIE). 150 of these fourwheel cement wagons were built between 1964 and 1972 with the last being withdrawn in 2009.

IRM is releasing a number of different triple packs covering CIE orange and grey together with the later ivory over black livery which came in from the late 1970s as seen on our review sample. Each pack features three vehicles with unique numbers and all wagons are fitted with 16.5mm gauge wheelsets, to

operate on 'OO' gauge track, together with small tension locks in NEM coupling pockets.

Our sample pack featured a high level of detail throughout with many separately fitted plastic parts including brake gear, vacuum pipes, pipework and more. In addition etched metal ladders and catwalks are fitted to each 'bubble' which finishes them off superbly.




Bachmann's 'OO' gauge Class 47/0 returns as 47245 in charter train operator West Coast Railways' (WCR) attractive maroon livery. Built at Brush Traction's Loughborough Works in 1965, the prototype entered traffic as D1922, allocated to BR's Cardiff

Canton depot. In 1973 it was renumbered 47245 and remained in service until withdrawal in 1999. It was subsequently reinstated to traffic in 2002 and remains part of WCR's fleet based at Carnforth and has been a regular performer on charter services and stock movements for the company.

Bachmann's release captures the appearance of the prototype well with a high-quality maroon satin paint finish together with grey roof and distinctive small yellow warning panels. Crisply printed WCR branding, data panels, numbers, 10A (Carnforth) depot plaques, modern overhead warning flashes and small solebar labels add to the embellishment. head and tail lights, illuminated cab interiors, 21-pin Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder socket, small tension lock couplings in NEM pockets, a pack of bufferbeam details and a 40mm x 20mm speaker mount for digital installations. A pair of switches beneath the fuel tanks enable the cab lights and tail lights to be switched on and off on analogue. (MC)

Later in the volume, overviews are broken down in sections covering specific time periods in the final year encompassing locomotive allocations, introduction of diesel locomotive duties, breakdown of Monday to Friday, Saturday and Sunday duties, observations and much more.

Accompanied by a super selection of more than 300 monochrome and colour photographs, this superlative tome also contains extracts from official documents. If you crave nuts and bolt detail, you won't be disappointed. (MC)



DCC Concepts delivers its GROUND SIGNALS

Ever since DCC Concepts announced that it would be producing colour light ground signals for 'OO' gauge we've been eager to see the results – and now they have arrived. The range covers early two-light, the more common three-light and the latest four-light British styles as well as an American outline two-light signal. Each features a high quality plastic casing with light colours selected to suit the era of their operation. For example, the most modern four-light signals have white LED lights while the earlier signals have softer warm white lights to represent the bulbs used in the real signals. Each signal is pre-wired and comes mounted

on a metal post which requires a 4mm diameter hole to be drilled (a drill bit is included in the 12-pack with Alpha board) through the baseboard to accommodate the signal. The leads have plugs attached and they have been designed to work with DCC Concepts Alpha Mimic control boards – none of which requires soldering.

The mimic board can be connected directly to the DCC track or accessory feed and given a range of addresses to control 12 signals. Joining everything together takes a matter of minutes and results in a set of working signals. Splitters to control two signals from one output are included in the 12-pack and there are additional extension cables available separately to increase the range of the wires from each signal.

This is a comprehensive and cost-effective way of introducing ground signals to a layout. With the 12-pack costing just under £100 it works out

at just over £8 per signal – and you get a control board, cables, drill and screws thrown in too. Great value and a great product which we are already planning to install on Hornby Magazine's exhibition layouts. (MW)





Making baseboard joints for portable layouts just got a little bit simpler as DCC Concepts has discovered a by-product of its Legacy track making components: scale sleepers which can be used as anchor points in place of copper-clad strip at baseboard joints. The packs contain 80 pre-etched 32mm long sleepers for 'OO' gauge, each of which has a pair of soldering pads positioned at the correct spacing for 16.5mm rails. The packs are available in 1.0mm and 1.6mm thicknesses making them suitable for use with Peco code 100 and code 75 tracks as well as others. Another good point is that they are electrically isolated as delivered, so there is no need for scoring of the upper surface. Simple, effective and readily available. (MW)





More importantly, Oxford Rail has made changes to the model to increase its accuracy including a new smokebox door of the correct pattern, repositioning of the washout plugs so that they don't conflict with the handrail, and alteration of the cabside profile. The additional rivets on top of the driving wheel splashers remain, but overall this is a vast improvement over the original model of 2309 in Great Western lined green with the smokebox being the most visually appealing change to the face of the 0-6-0.

The plain black livery suits these small freight engines better than lined green in our view and all in Oxford Rail has done a good job in turning the fortunes for what will be a highly useful GWR built freight engine for layouts of all shapes and sizes.

Internally this issue of the Dean Goods' is identical to the original. The motor, housed in the boiler, has low current draw of around 0.1 amps when operated on analogue control and proved to be as responsive as it was

smooth running. An 8-pin DCC decoder socket is provided in the tender together with a space to support an ESU 'sugar cube' type speaker, but be aware that due to the design a decoder will need to be chosen carefully to ensure it fits in the compact tender body.

Whether hauling a pick-up goods on a branch or a long mixed on the main line, these venerable 0-6-0s have great potential for 'OO' gauge BR Western Region layouts. You can even use them on passenger work too. (MW)

DCC Concepts has updated the design for its outstanding solenoid accessory decoders, releasing new versions of the twin and eight output boards. The most noticeable change is the addition of an aluminium shroud over the electronics giving them a cleaner look, but the updates are much more than skin deep.

To make the units more user friendly, a charge light is included on the shroud which shows when the capacitors have charge in them – a useful feature during operation, but even more so during installation. To assist in safe wiring for these decoders, a new discharge button has been included on the circuit board too – press and hold until the light goes out and there will be no power left on board, reducing the risk of

damage to the circuits during wiring to zero. One final change is the addition of through wiring connections at each end of the board, all clearly labelled. This means that there is no longer a need to double up wiring at the connection point to link with further accessory decoder boards.

All the original features still stand including high powered capacitors which ensure positive throw for high power draw solenoid motors as well as frog switching, LED feedback, switch connection and single button addressing for each output.

We've used the originals on several layouts with great success and these updates simply make a great product even better. Reliable, powerful, simple to install and now with inbuilt security. (MW)

SPOTTHEDIFFERENCE... THECLECTIC CLASS47s

Once British Railways most common mixed-traffic diesel, the Class 47s all looked much the same on the outside - but in fact there were many variations. **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** explains all.



HE BRUSH TYPE 4, or Class 47 as it was later known, truly was the all-purpose workhorse of the modernisation era. At home on everything from the humble pick-up freight to the most tightly-timed express, these 2,750hp locomotives once dominated the railway scene and could be seen almost everywhere on the network.

Designed by Brush at Loughborough, the prototype D1500 first made its appearance in 1962, being followed over the next six years by a further 511 examples, with construction being shared between Brush and Crewe Works. As outlined in HM63, the original design used components intended for a final batch of Class 46 'Peaks', but packaged in a completely new integral body design that had the result of producing a high-powered yet relatively lightweight machine.

EARLY DIFFERENCES

However right from the outset there were significant differences within the class. The first 20 locomotives D1500-D1519 were equipped for both steam and electric train heating but this feature was not continued and subsequent locomotives intended for passenger duties were turned out with only the facility to provide steam heat. These early locomotives also had some internal differences: for instance, their radiator fans were driven electrically rather than hydrostatically.

Some locomotives were built without

any form of train heating equipment at all with D1782-D1836/D1875-D1900 having neither boiler or electric heat fitted from new but even when steam heat was fitted, there were three different styles of boiler, with Spanner, Clayton and Stone Vapour all providing equipment at various times. Some were built with both air and vacuum train brakes from new with D1631-D1681 and all from D1758 being the engines involved.

When British Rail adopted the TOPS computerised system in the early 1970s the opportunity was taken to group the different types of Class 47 together, making them easier to recognise. The 'standard' steam heat locomotive was allocated Class 47/0 while the 81 locomotives built for freight duties and not equipped with any form of train heating equipment were designated Class 47/3s. Locomotives equipped with Electric Train Supply (ETS) or with both steam and electric train heating equipment became Class 47/4.

However, by this time BR had decided that there should be a gradual movement towards air brakes and at the same time steam heating of trains was gradually being phased out. This led to Class 47/0s being stripped of their boilers as they passed through works, some of these were fitted with electric train heat equipment and were then renumbered as Class 47/4s while others remained as they were but without any heating equipment, being then reallocated to freight work.

Many of these received dual braking equipment, but some did not at first, while later vacuum brake equipment was either isolated or removed altogether. These changes led to a large number of variations in appearance to what was, on the face of it, a highly-standardised class with external variations in bufferbeam detail, tanks and radiator grilles being the most noticeable.

While the ex-steam heat locomotives saw many modifications and changes, the same was not true of those built exclusively for freight use. The 47/3 sub-class remained fairly intact, although locomotives in this group had air brake equipment added as they were overhauled. One additional 47/3 was created in 1992 when 47468 became 47300 and replaced accident-damaged 47343. Conversions meant that the number of Class 47/4s rose to a total of 154, with a further 109 being added a few years later as more new modern rolling stock came into service.



PROTOTYPES AND PUSH-PULL

A further sub-class was created in 1974 when 47046 became 47601 and was fitted with a 16-cylinder Ruston engine for test purposes, this particular locomotive being selected because it had been damaged in an accident. Later this same locomotive became the only member of Class 47/9 when it was again re-engined, this time with a 12-cylinder Ruston engine, becoming 47901.

A more significant sub-class came along in 1979 when 12 Class 47/4 locomotives had push-pull equipment added and were allocated to Glasgow-Edinburgh duties. This conversion saw extra jumper cables attached to the cab ends, larger fuel tanks fitted and additional equipment in the cabs, such as guard to driver communication telephones and an extra emergency brake handle. These became Class 47/7s and four more were added in 1985 making the number series 47701-47716, although an extra one, 47717, was added in 1988 after 47713 was written off in a fire.

Initially turned out in BR blue, these locomotives were soon adorned in a new Scotrail livery. Towards the end of their lives these locomotives gravitated to the Waterloo-South West route where they ultimately



gained Network SouthEast colours.

The Class 47/7 designation was reused a few years later when there was a demand from the parcels sector for locomotives that could propel trains into mail terminals. To achieve this some former Class 306 EMUs had been converted so that their driving cabs, which were at the back of the train, could be used to control the brake and also to provide a signal to the driver as to how much power should be provided during the move.

This second batch of 47/7s was not fitted with proper TDM push-pull control and could not be used in true push-pull mode, but they did have larger fuel tanks fitted. The number series for these locomotives followed on almost from the Edinburgh-Glasgow engines and started at 47721, with these being easily identifiable in their early days due to their Parcels Sector livery and additional cab-end jumpers.

Two further locomotives also carried the designation Class 47/7 and these were



the 'Royal' pair of 47798 and 47799. These two sported a number of detail differences, the most noticeable of which was that they had only one cab-end RCH jumper cable and also that they carried a distinctive claret livery. Despite their intended use they could often be seen on other duties away from the Royal Train.

INCREASING RANGE

As the strict boundaries between the old regions began to be broken down under British Rail the practice of changing locomotives at frequent intervals during long cross-country journeys declined but this brought with it another problem, which was that most of the Class 47/4s had limited fuel capacity. Most retaining 850gallon tanks that they had been fitted with from new. While this had been adequate for their original intended purpose, the extra demands of the ETS equipment plus longer runs often left them perilously short of fuel.

The last of the Class 47/4 conversions 47650-47665 had been fitted with extra fuel tanks, bringing the capacity up to 1,120gallons and four other Class 47/4s had later been converted

to a similar specification. So that these locomotives could be easily identified they were grouped together in a new sub-class, 47/8, from 1989 onwards.

When the class was first formed the number series ran from 47801-820 but additional locomotives were converted as time went on and the series eventually ended at 47854. This sub-class proved to be one of the longest-lived as they were extensively overhauled fairly late in life for use on the South East to North West corridor, being seen in both InterCity and Virgin colours.

As deliveries of new trains accelerated under privatisation, the Class 47s found themselves ousted from many of their former duties. All but five of the class were still around in 1986 but from then on there was a steady decline, starting with locomotives that had non-standard features or which were life expired.

REBIRTH

However, even that was not to be the end for there was to be another variation for the Class 47 and this occurred in 1998 when the decision was taken to re-engineer some of the class to improve both reliability and performance. Brush Traction at Loughborough took freight locomotive 47356 and completely rebuilt it, fitting a more modern EMD power unit and a Class 56-style alternator, with the completed locomotive emerging as 57001.

Early production conversions were freight machines for Freightliner but in 2001 an ETS-fitted version made an appearance when 47825 became 57601. A total of 33 Class 47s were eventually converted including 12 for Virgin Trains which had Dellner couplers housed in a recess in the front of the cab for towing Class 390 Pendolino Electric Multiple Units.

Today the Class 47, and its Class 57 variant, are still much sought after by charter and special trains companies and there are still a handful employed on freight work, particularly by DRS. The Class 57 is also used by Great Western on its 'Night Riviera' sleeper service.

In its more than half a century career the Class 47 has appeared in a surprising number of guises and with an extensive array of modifications. Getting the detail of an individual locomotive right at a particular point in its career is extremely challenging and is perhaps only capable of being achieved if a good quality photograph of your chosen example is available.

MAHNGACONN

There are several different types and standards of digital decoder connector available today. **PAUL CHETTER** explains the differences and clears up the mystery of socket formats.

O UNDERSTAND why we have such a wide diversity of different Digital Command Control (DCC) connectors, it is helpful to know a little of the background. In the late 1970s, several different manufacturers introduced their own proprietary systems to control the behaviour of individual locomotives on the same powered track as other models.

In the UK Hornby introduced its pioneering Zero 1 in 1979, a name clearly embracing the 0s and 1s which are the basis of digital technology. The system was targeted at 'OO' gauge models. The 'decoder' hardware chosen restricted the number of individual addresses to 16, each with six different speed settings. Almost simultaneously, in Austria, Zimo produced its 'multi-train control' system with 99 addresses and 16 speed settings. The module was very large and only suitable for large scale and garden railways. In Germany and USA, companies also began to develop their own competing systems.

The National Model Railroad Association (NMRA) in the USA




has been setting Standards and Recommendations for model railways since 1935. In Europe since 1954, MOROP has documented its standards as **European Standards for Model** Railways. These standards are more usually referred to as NEM.

The resulting fragmentation of developmental effort was recognised as being bad for consumers and expensive for manufacturers. Dr Lenz offered to open his system to all manufacturers, providing that the resulting products could

be universally interchanged.

After close collaboration between the NMRA and MOROP, internationally agreed standards for DCC emerged. To ensure compliance, standards were introduced covering a number of different areas. To aid operation, standardised ways to connect decoders to models became desirable. These have almost all taken the pragmatic route of adapting whatever industry standard connectors were available at the time and adapting them for use in railway modelling.

Different socket types are used across '00' gauge including 6-pin, Next18, 8-pin and 21-pin in both formats. At Crimson Road, Peter Griffiths''OO' depot scene, Bachmann, Heljan and Hornby rolling stock using both 8-pin and 21-pin sockets are operated side-by-side.



NMRA AND NEM 652



This is a typical PCB from a recently released model. Manufacturers are still fitting the 8-pin interface to models with modest additional functions.

The familiar two-row, four-position 8-pin connector was adopted for this role. Unlike the JST connector, the 8-pin plug could be inserted in two orientations, 180 degrees apart.

To prevent potentially catastrophic shorting, the function of each pin was standardised. The design incorporates a fail-safe arrangement with the track pick-up wires and motor wires fitted diagonally opposite to their respective partners on the outer four pins. Turned through 180 degrees, their relative positions remain the same and so there is no impact on the running or electrical integrity.

Most decoders also provide a number of Function Outputs allowing the powering and control of other features such as smoke generators or lighting. The other four pin positions are used for front lights (white wire), rear lights (yellow wire) and a spare (green wire). Power for these is provided via the common positive (blue wire).


If the plug is orientated incorrectly, the blue common positive of the socket will not be connected to that of the plug and so no power will be available. Although no lights or smoke will be available, the electrical isolation ensures safety.

One advantage of the wired 8-pin decoder is that the harness allows some flexibility for the final location of the decoder. However, this is also a potential drawback as there is a need to accommodate what might become a thick tangle of wires. A solution to the latter can be found in the direct fit style of 8-pin decoder. In this type, there are no external wires to the pins which are an integral part of the package.

It is worth noting when selecting direct fit 8-pin decoders that common practice in US manufactured models is to align the socket longitudinally whereas UK models have the socket set at 90 degrees to the longitudinal axis. As a consequence, there are often a clearance issue if a decoder with pins set in the wrong orientation for the model is used.

As manufacturers began to exploit the control of ancillaries that is possible with DCC, decoders with more Function Outputs have become readily available. The standard 8-pin connector is not able to carry more than three FOs; typically '4 function' decoders have the 4th on a brown or a purple flying lead. Furthermore, there is no provision for speaker connections from sound decoders.

Whilst the 8-pin solution is still common, an interface with multiple connections would enable more convenient access to all the decoder's outputs.




A typical 8-pin sound decoder has eight wires to the plug, one additional FO wire and two speaker wires. If any further FOs are accessed additional wiring will be required.





One way to remove bulk is to avoid the wires. These direct-plug Digitrax decoders show how this arrangement operates. There are two versions of this decoder. each suitable for a different orientation of the socket within its surroundinas.

NMRA 21MTC AND NEM 660




This PCB is fitted with a 21MTC interface. The pins are fitted to this connector. Pin 11 is missing, forming the index position.

ESU developed such an interface for Märklin, the latter requiring some very specific characteristics for the FOs Aux 3 and above. It used connectors with two rows of 11 positions, one pin of which is removed to provide an index for correct orientation. This is the 21MTC (Märklin Trix Connector), essentially a proprietary interface which requires logic level power at Aux 3 and above. The model's electronics would as a consequence be required to provide amplification of the power to usable levels.

As the developer, ESU 21pin decoders are fully 21MTC compliant. Both the voltage and polarity at Aux 3 and above are different from Aux 1 and 2.

Most other manufacturers of 21pin decoders rejected the 'logic level' restrictions on Aux 3 and 4 (because


of legacy naming conventions these are actually FOs 5 and 6) and for a time it became the recognised NMRA standard that all FOs would be 'Open Collector' otherwise known as 'Full Power' outputs. This is currently under review. This has resulted in two different standards applying to what is for the typical end user an identical connector.

Zimo makes two similar 21-pin sound decoders - one of which complies with each standard - plus a non-sound decoder which can, using a CV change, transform between standards to suit the circumstances. During 2016, TCS adapted its 21-pin decoders to comply with 21MTC standards.

For many years, these two types have co-existed in the UK with little apparent problem. ESU users learned that to operate features with Aux 3 and 4, they would need to add the required amplification. ESU even sells an adaptor board to make these the equivalent of open collector FOs.


The typical feature set of UK models using 21-pin connectors has, until recently, not required the use of Aux 3 or above. Since the two standards only diverge at this point there was no industry experience to highlight the differences.

The use of 21MTC interface was declared obsolescent in 2010 and the NMRA has actively discouraged its use in new model designs. However, its use is so widespread that it is likely to continue for some time to come.



NMRA PLUX8/12/16/22 AND NEM 658



To avoid such confusion, in 2009 MOROP designed a standardised interface called PluX of which there are several sizes, PluX22 being the equivalent of the 21MTC connection. Smaller PluX16, PluX12 and PluX8 are also defined in the NEM norms and NMRA standards. Whilst superficially this might seem like for individual interfaces,

the 16, 12 and 8 are subsets of the PluX22; any pins present will conform to the same connections as PluX22. So, for instance, if a model is equipped with a PluX22 connector, any PluX decoder can be fitted safely in the knowledge that they will operate correctly (up to the limit of the decoder's pins).

This is possible as the basic connections are arranged about the centre of the socket with the higher FOs accommodated towards the outer ends. The index pin (pin 11) is in the centre so all decoders from the smallest to the full 22 have access to the vital connections grouped there.

This offers users a greater choice whilst providing a straightforward method of upgrading.

SMALLER GAUGES


21-pin and 8-pin connectors are generally too bulky to be accommodated in 'N' gauge models or in models of small locomotives. There are three main alternative connector types available.

The 6-pin format was developed to meet these needs. They may be of the 'direct' type, where the six connecting pins are fixed to the decoder or the type which have a short wiring harness terminating in a 'six in line' plug. In each case it is important to observe the correct orientation for all features to work correctly, but no damage will occur if inadvertently fitted incorrectly. Pin No. 1 should be identified on the decoder and socket.

The 6-pin interface has pins for track and motor (positive and negative for each) plus 'headlamp front' and 'headlamp rear' returns. There are no pins available for a common positive or additional function outputs.

Some 6-pin decoders have more than two function outputs. These are usually accessible via solder pads on the decoder. These types normally also have a dedicated positive output – this is via a solder pad or a flying lead. Sound decoders with a 6-pin interface normally have an extra pair of wires (either purple or brown) already attached for connection to the speaker.


The 6-pin solution is an interface which meets the requirements for small format decoders, but without certain measures to modify the decoder's specification, restricts the features which can be provided. PluX8 and PluX12 interfaces


Below: A Zimo MX649N 6-pin sound decoder being inserted into the socket.




NEM 662


The Next18 interface introduced in 2011 provides all the basic requirements plus up to six FOs,

or up to four FOs and two speaker connections in the case of sound decoders. One advantage of this system is that the connectors themselves are very low profile, helping to reduce overall thickness. Some European models have been fitted with Next18 decoders since 2012, so the technology is



are available and have the advantage of commonality with other PluX types. Whilst the decoders themselves are required to conform to rigorous (and small) physical dimensions, the connectors add considerably to the thickness and therefore the depth of space required to be set aside within the model. There are many European models which use this interface, but they have not been used in UK models.





LARGER SCALES

The power required from a decoder is directly related to the maximum power drawn by the model's motor or motors. Many 'O' gauge models have very modest power requirements and so decoder types usually associated with 'OO' gauge can easily match their needs. Many of the recent models from Minerva, Dapol and Little Loco Company are fitted with 8-pin, 21-pin and PluX22 decoders respectively.

More robust, and generally considerably larger decoders, are available for large or multimotored 'O' gauge models, and for Gauge 1 or above. The ESU XL decoders are rated at 4A continuous motor power, whilst the Zimo MX699KV can pump out 6A continuous motor power and up to 10A burst for 20 seconds.

Consequently, the connections are required to be able to handle much higher power transmission. For a long time, these decoders have been fitted with screw terminal blocks for hardwiring to the model's internal wiring.

CHOICES

The current crop of decoder socket arrangements offers a broad spectrum to suit everything from the smallest 'N' gauge locomotives to a high current drawing garden railway locomotive and all stations in between. Manufacturers regularly include reference to the decoder socket type on the end of the box – particularly Bachmann, Dapol and Heljan which have used more than one socket type during production - while Hornby has remained connected to the 8-pin arrangement for all of its DCC ready models.


In all cases choosing the right decoder starts with assessing the onboard connection provided in the locomotive, but should you have any questions either the manufacturer or a digital control specialist will be able to advise on which chips are best suited to the model. At any rate, once you understand the basics it is a simple learning curve to establish which decoder you will require to make the most of your models.

well proven. Recent, newly tooled models from Graham Farish have been fitted with Next18 sockets;

the 'Castle' and Class 40 (below) being prime examples. Some of the smaller Bachmann Branchline 'OO'

gauge models have been fitted with Next18 sockets too and Dapol is set to introduce this interface too.

The Next18 decoder socket is the latest design to appear in compact British outline models. This is the new Graham Farish Class 40 which has a Next18

Stann's Depot layouts are a perfect means of showcasing a large collection of locomotives. MAX FOWLER reveals the story of this

'OO' gauge depot layout, which sadly has now been lost forever.

HE LAYOUT came about after my interest in model railways was rekindled following a change in personal circumstances and a limited space became available in a small 'study' in my house. The majority of my rolling stock, some of which had been stored for many years and others recently purchased, was primarily Rail Blue with a significant number of different locomotive classes included. Given this, and remembering my teenage trips round numerous locomotive depots – individually while using Rail Rover tickets, and with others on Scottish Railfans organised weekend trips, I immediately came to the conclusion that the simplest layout to fit the space and the collection of locomotives would be a very compact Traction Maintenance Depot (TMD).

Using various illustrated books acquired over the years on diesel depots and their fixtures and fittings and my own collection of photographs and reasonable recollections of depot visits, I used the Peco point templates to try and squeeze as much as I could into the available space, but given that I only had 7ft 6in x 2ft to play with, my options were pretty limited. A blank sheet of wallpaper was used and the templates laid out to ensure maximum operating potential. Work on the layout commenced in 2004 and was complete for the Cathcart Model Railway Show in October 2007. This was the first proper layout I had built and finished.

THE LAYOUT

The layout was built by myself but subsequently purchased by my model railway club – The Glasgow and West of Scotland MRC. The layout is set in Eastern England. The idea I was trying to achieve was that of an old steam shed which was due to be demolished and had lost its roof and had numerous smashed windows. This idea was partly influenced by a visit many years ago to Westhouses Depot, although its roof had already been removed when I was there. >>>

In addition, I envisaged an old turntable pit had been filled in but the retaining wall that formed part of the same could still be seen forming the outline of the circle. I also wanted to have some overgrown track that would have exited from the old turntable when the depot was dieselised while another sign of the old steam shed is part of the ramp that would have led to the old coaling stage.

Locomotives enter the depot from a single line off an imaginary main line and run into the reception siding. From there, they run into the wash plant road or one of two main sidings. They can then reverse back to the two fuelling roads or instead of any of these, they could go up to the headshunt which allows access to the main three shed roads.

The layout, when built, had a large shed which was as described earlier, but an accident meant the shed was damaged beyond repair and was replaced by a shorter, modern shed, which ironically is in keeping with the intention of having the steam shed replaced!

While the layout was not built with the intention of going to exhibitions, it did make a debut at the Cathcart show in 2007 and subsequently went to Model Rail

Scotland in 2011. It also attended shows at Rutherglen, Ayr, Bonnybridge and Cathcart again when it was put up for sale.

Given the age of some of my original locomotives, I decided to use Peco code 100 track, and to make the most of the limited space available most of the points had to be of the 'Y' type. While the 'Y' points saved on space, they have proved to be problematic when using Class 20s running together with screw couplings due to buffer locking.

The layout is DC operated and uses a basic master controller and a secondary handheld which allows two locomotives to be operated on different parts of the shed at the same time. The track, due to operation being DC, is split into 19 sections and all points (utilising Peco point motors) are controlled via a 12v DC supply using a standard stud/pencil arrangement on a master control panel which also has colour light signal switches.

There are few areas of scenery away from the railway, these being limited to the back of the layout including the road area that covers the hidden siding where the locomotives are put on or taken off, at each end of the layout and a small area at the front that forms the curve where

the turntable pit was located. On the railway side there are several structures comprising a boiler house and water tower, both Metcalfe Kits, a locomotive wash plant, engine fuelling bases, diesel fuel unloading areas and portable buildings, all Knightwing. In addition, the original shed was made up from parts of Airfix locomotive depot sides strengthened internally with Plasticard and cross-roof beams that would have supported the original roof structure.

When this original building got damaged, our club member Archie Brown built a new detailed depot building based on the type of structure found on many new diesel depots throughout Central England. There are also numerous lighting gantries around the layout and some colour light signals at the entrance and exit of the depot and some ground signals to avoid conflicting movements.

To add a little character of the period the layout has a contingent of 'spotters' moving about the depot with notebooks and cameras supervised by two members of staff with the obligatory orange vests. Spotters can be seen on the road overlooking the depot too — a reflection of myself. We use these 'spotters' as a way to interest


the youngsters who view the layout in that we ask them to find all 12 although one in particular is partly hidden and we normally have to point this last one out.

THE TRAINS

The main stock for the layout consists of numerous classes and manufacturers of locomotives. There are at least six Bachmann Class 08s - which were very common on depots at weekends, together with a collection of Class 20s, 25s and 37s, Hornby Class 56s and Heljan Class 47s. Occasionally, a Mainline Class 45 and Jouef Class 40 can also make an appearance alongside a Class 03 shunter. Also available, having brought in a 'Merrymaker' service from further afield, is a Hornby Class 50 and some Heljan Class 26s or a Class 27. A two-car Metro-Cammell Diesel Multiple Unit is also seen from time to time and a new High Speed Train power car is sometimes seen lurking in the shed for crew training purposes.

Almost all of this stock is Rail Blue apart from two of the Class 56s which are in 'large logo' blue and the HST power car. The only wagons on the layout are some Bachmann fuel tankers that serve >>>

the diesel fuel unloading areas. When the layout was bought by my club, it allowed other club members to utilise their stock and that was the case the last time the layout was exhibited at Cathcart.

St Ann's Depot was the first layout I ever got around to completing and while it took me a while to get it to this position, it was an enjoyable exercise. I learnt many things from its construction and used these lessons on my subsequent layout Maxwell Colliery Loading Point (HM105) which will be making an appearance at Model Rail Scotland in February 2018.


There is always an argument as to whether a depot layout really is a 'layout'. I consider it is and with so much in a compact space there is plenty of interest - not just with locomotives arriving and departing the depot, and moving around same - for the public to look at, or examine.

Given the enjoyment I got out of the

layout, and then the members of my model railway club when they purchased it from me, it is likely that after my current coal traffic layout has run its course, I will likely build a new servicing depot this time for use with my Trainload Coal locomotives, although my treasured Rail Blue locomotives could also see a return too.

Unfortunately, the story does not have a happy ending in that Nigel Burkin's pictures were taken in December 2016 and just less than two months later, a devastating fire in a commercial unit next to our clubrooms resulted in serious damage to our premises and as a result we lost three layouts to severe smoke and soot damage including St Ann's Depot. As you will appreciate, this was a great loss to all concerned and we are just so grateful that we have these photographs which show the layout before it was lost. As someone commented, now would be the time to build a new depot layout.

Farewell to the 4BIGFOUR'

Nationalisation is a hot topic at the moment. **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** looks at the history of British Railways in its formative years.

XACTLY 70 YEARS AGO at the stroke of midnight on January 1 1948 locomotive whistles sounded all over the country as railwaymen celebrated the nationalisation of the industry. For some people this was a defining moment in history but for others it was just another step in a process that was already a century old, and which continues to the present day.

To those interested in railways, 1948 holds huge significance because that

was when ownership of the network passed from private individuals into state hands, the public being told it would bring with it a new era of investment and right the wrongs of years of underinvestment and mismanagement.


Unfortunately, as with many things, this wasn't quite the whole story and the 'people's railway' was set to struggle on for many years before the promised investment arrived - and when it did much of it was wasted. Hopes that state ownership

would mean the retention of more of the system were dashed by mounting losses, and the subsequent Beeching report saw many lines closed and jobs lost.

It is rather surprising to learn that the first Act of Parliament giving the British Government the power to take over the railways wasn't passed in 1947 or 1948 at all, but by Sir Robert Peel's Conservative Government in 1844 more than 100 years earlier. The Railway Regulation Act was promoted not by the left wing but by







manufacturers and traders concerned that the railways were abusing their monopoly in setting charges for freight movements. In the event the threat of nationalisation was sufficient to bring the railway companies to heel and the Act was never brought into force.

The passing of the 1844 Act then, as

The passing of the 1844 Act then, as now, led many politicians to proclaim that the railways would be better off being a state asset but opinion on this matter was always divided with the opposite view being expressed by Sir Rowland Hill in a minority report for the 1867 Royal Commission on Railways, in which he warned politicians and the public of 'undue enlargement of expectation' from those advocating nationalisation.

STRATEGIC TAKEOVER

Things moved on in 1871 when the government gave itself the power to take over the railways in the event of war or a national emergency and this could be done without any form of compensation. These powers were enacted in 1914 and as a result the following five years were to become pivotal in setting up the railways for many years of decline. Effectively nationalised but with actual operations left to the owning companies, the railways suffered from the effects of raging inflation while its income was pegged by the government, leaving an uncomfortable hole in their finances.

At the end of the war, the system had become run down and was due to be returned to private hands - but there were many in politics who thought that the railways should remain in state hands. The Tory-Liberal coalition government of 1919 declared that it would formally nationalise the system with Lloyd George stating that he was in complete sympathy with the proposal, but in the event the necessary legislation was never enacted. The railways struggled on but with their profits pegged to pre-war levels, thanks to a government tribunal.

Consequently, and reeling from a cash shortage which partially arose from >>





government intervention - and with their core business under attack from thousands of newly set-up road haulage companies, the railway companies were forcibly merged into four large groups in 1921, taking effect from January 1 1923. This initiative again came from a government that had realised that its earlier policies had pushed some of the smaller companies perilously close to bankruptcy.

It took around ten years of private investment before the railway system was back to something like its pre-First World War level, during which time freight rates were strictly dictated by government, unlike competing road transport which could charge whatever it wished. In 1938

the railways sought the same freedom from government intervention enjoyed by the road transport industry with a 'Square Deal' campaign and this might have succeeded had the Second World War not broken out. This conflict saw the railways brought under government control again but this time at a lower level of payments than before. Naturally the railways objected but after being threatened with full nationalisation, they backed down.

Again, the railways were dealt a poor hand because the government set rates according to costs while allowing all other industries to raise theirs as they required. As with the first conflict, this resulted in a gap opening between income and expenditure which was to some extent mitigated by deferring maintenance, meaning that by the end of the war the system was in a very poor state of repair indeed.

The railways would likely have been able to recover in less than ten years using private capital just as they had done in 1918 but by this time with a Labour government in power the party had a long-held ambition to have the system under state control. It was argued that by removing the profit element fares could be kept down, investment could be raised and that the system was so run down intervention was necessary.

Nationalisation was not universally supported, though, and was opposed by Chambers of Commerce, shippers, the CBI and not least of all the companies themselves. The Railway Companies Association demanded a public enquiry claiming that the compensation offered, which was in fact in the form of bonds which matured over a lengthy period, was inadequate while London and North Eastern Railway Chairman Sir Ronald Matthews went further, describing the government's actions as 'capable of making a Barbary pirate blush.'

Despite all this, on January 1 1948, the government nationalised £1bn worth of railway assets without parting with a penny. Those who owned the railways would have to wait for up to 40 years to get their money back but those who worked in the industry were jubilant because they had been told that there would be more investment, better wages and conditions and an end to poor management who were only interested in lining their own pockets. It would be at last the 'people's railway'.





CENTRAL CONTROL

As might have been expected the new nationalised railway brought with it centralised control with policy being dictated by the Minister of Transport. The new Chief Regional Officers did not have autonomy or overall control but instead answered to a cumbersome committee structure. Some of the promised investment went into running this structure and some into buying up half a million privately-owned colliery wagons, many of which were only fit for scrap, at a cost of £43m, while the companies that maintained them were financially supported even though they were not themselves nationalised. Replacement

rolling stock programmes proceeded at about a third of the rate suggested in 1947 and for a while any new locomotives built were to the designs of the now redundant 'big four' private companies.

At first the new nationalised railway was able to pay its way, mainly because the road transport industry was yet to make a significant impact on long-distance traffic, and it continued to do so until 1952. However, under state ownership some lines which were economically unviable were quietly done away with, continuing a policy that had been in progress prior to the war when in private hands.

From 1952 onwards the surplus on the operating account declined sharply and within 18 months it was insufficient to meet capital charges. By 1960 it produced a loss of £67m which rose to £87m the following year and from then on continually spiralled out of control, despite the savings promised by the 1955 Modernisation Plan.


SWEEPING CHANGES

As is well-known, Dr Richard Beeching brought a hatchet to the network after the recommendations contained in his 1963 report were accepted but even this failed to stem the losses and despite the efforts of politicians of various colours the railways have never returned to profitability since. After only 40 years under state control, John Major's Conservative Government began to re-privatise the railways by selling off the assets, only for infrastructure provider Railtrack to eventually fail and to be brought back into state control as Network Rail.

It is probably fair to say that January 1 1948 did not herald the new dawn of the railways that those promoting it hoped it would. For those involved with working the trains not much changed while for those travelling on or watching the network the only visible signs came in the form of new logos and rebranding. The profits which were promoted as soon to flow back into the industry failed to materialise and turned into unsustainable losses while inflexible centralised management proved to be no match for the free-market road and air transport industries.

It is interesting to note that once again, 170 years since it was first mooted, railway nationalisation is on the political agenda with some of the comments made by today's advocates bearing a resemblance to those of long-gone politicians such as Sir Rowland Hill and Lloyd George. Whether anything comes of this in the future we are yet to see.

From a modeller's point of view, the nationalisation of 1948 brought with it the opportunity to see new liveries and stock from constituent companies being used a long way from home. We can also model an era which was undergoing dramatic change from wartime austerity to the optimism of the 1950s and perhaps give ourselves a little of the flavour of that feelgood factor which, it was hoped, would bring us a better and fairer Britain.







RESURREC

eING ATTHE CONTROLS of Twelve Trees is a great way to spend a day. Time goes by exceptionally quickly as there is so much potential on the layout for movements.

A signature of the layout is the collection of Electric Multiple Units (EMUs) and, quite frankly, we are spoilt for choice when it comes to ready-to-run stock.

The roster includes 4-CEPs, 2-EPBs and MLVs from Bachmann, 4-TC and 2-Hs from Kernow Model Rail Centre as well as 5-BEL, 2-BIL, 2-HAL and 4-VEP units from Hornby. All in, between myself and Mark, we have more units from those classes than we will ever need for the layout, but that doesn't stop me wanting and introducing more. At the Warley National Model

Railway Exhibition Redditch Model Railway Club member John Tisi kindly loaned his Ayjay Models kit-built Bulleid Tin-HAL two-car unit to us for the weekend and we enjoyed operating it so much that it was an easy choice to go round to the Ayjay stand and purchase a kit to build myself. That is next on the workbench with the target of having it ready for the layout's next outing at the Basingstoke Model Railway Exhibition on March 10/11 2018.

Before that though, conversations at the show also prompted me to review some of the kit-built stock

that I had originally built for Bay Street Shed. These had been put to one side awaiting conversion to digital control, but as they all used Black Beetle or Tenshodo motor bogies I wanted to introduce additional pick-ups to enhance their running qualities. I'd already added a decoder to one, but its operation wasn't reliable enough for it to enter the regular fleet.

Happily I have found the means to change that, so progressing

through the workbench first was a Bulleid pattern 2-EPB unit which I built a few years ago from the No Nonsense Kits product. This has been run on Twelve Trees, but never with particular success. The Black Beetle didn't provide the consistency of current collection that I wanted, so a pair of DCC Concepts pick-ups have been fitted to the trailing bogie on the motor coach and wired into the

EMUs are firmly in favour on Mike's workbench, but there is plenty going on behind the scenes in the planning stages for 2018 and beyond. Watch this space.

The rolling stock for Twelve Trees Junction has been focused on ready-to-run products on the whole, but **MIKE WILD** has been delving into his back catalogue of kit-built units to introduce new variety to the EMU fleet.

decoder track connections. This has made an instant difference to its operation, so much so that I can now progress onto other stock. During tests what was once a stuttering unit (even with clean wheels) could now crawl around our test track at speed step one, even

without clean track. Success.

Two further units are on the workbench now - an Ayjay Models 4-SUB and a DC Kits 4-EPB. Both need the same modifications to their motor bogies, and both will also be checked over and enhanced with additional detailing.

On the 4-SUB, the plan is to complete the interiors (all of which were painted a long time ago but never fitted) as well as correcting the bufferbeam details and changing the headcodes to the correct format and colour. There are also a couple of repairs required to reinstate couplings between vehicles as well as replacing the guard irons on the bogies which have been damaged in storage. Still, it should only really take an evening to bring this unit up to scratch.

The 4-EPB will take a little bit more time as I rushed it through when I first built it for Bay Street a few years ago. The first steps were to repair the loose items on the chassis of each vehicle followed by addition of the cab side window frames and windscreen wipers with etched brass parts that I already had waiting to be fitted. Also on the list is a full set of handrails, door handles and bump stops

Left: As with all electrical work, the new connections were fully insulated to ensure there was no potential for short circuits. The remaining wiring was held in place with black

insulating tape.

With the wires fed back into the chassis by carefully routing them around underframe equipment, the new pick ups were connected to the black and red track feeds to the decoder. Insulation is next together with tidying of the wiring to fix it to the chassis.

to bring relief to the bodysides while I also have a full interior kit ready to be painted and installed.

Also now here from Dart Castings for the 4-EPB are cast metal air horns, jumper cables and new inner ends for the coaches which will include the single buffers between vehicles as well as correct alarm cable arrangements and steps. This unit might take a little longer to bring back into traffic, but it

will definitely be resurrected.

I'm pleased that I can now start looking more closely at the rolling stock for Twelve Trees having given the layout a thorough shakedown for the Great Electric Train Show and Warley during October and November. However, the layout itself is far from complete and there are big plans for it during 2018 to take it even further. I can't wait to get started.


