THIS ISSUE marks the launch of the 2018 Great Electric Train Show on the weekend of October 13/14 - and this year we have secured a brand new and bigger venue for the exhibition so that we can

deliver more layouts, demonstrations and trade stands to the show.

It's an exciting venture. The new venue is the Arena MK in Milton Keynes which is easy to access from the M1 and A43 as well as being a few minutes from Milton Keynes railway station which is served by Virgin Trains, West Midlands Trains and Southern. There is even a direct train from Clapham Junction to Milton Keynes via the North London line for those looking to travel from south of the capital.

The big bonus of the new venue is that we can make the show bigger than it ever has been. This year 30 layouts will take part and we've been scouring the country to find the very best of those featured in past issues of the magazine as well as searching out new layouts which we have yet to showcase. We've got three layouts travelling in from Scotland as well as more from Yorkshire, North Wales, Kent, East Riding, the Sussex coast and West London. It has been another busy month of new announcements and releases during March with five brand new British outline products being announced at the end of the month across 'OO' and 'O' gauges plus a trio of new locomotives arriving for review too.

Add to this new releases from Hornby, Locomotion Models and an exciting new Gresley 'A4' 4-6-2 sound file from Locoman Sounds and there is a great variety of new products to explore once more.

Also in the reviews is a fascinating product from Protocab - a wireless control system which provides a way of powering models by batteries, and in 'OO' gauge to boot. We've been exploring its potential and the manufacturers have got an extensive list of products in development which

could make this a rewarding system to use. You can read our full review on the starter pack on pages 82-83.

We've also brought together four layout features for this issue covering 'OO', 'O', 'SM32' and 2mm finescale layouts - one being an outdoor railway combining 'O' and live steam 'SM32' operations while the team has been hard at work developing step by step guides to help you get more from your projects.



RAILROAD'BUBBLE' SAMPLE DEBUTS



ORNBY has received the first decorated sample of its first RailRoad version of the Class 121 single-car Diesel Multiple Unit (DMU) for 'OO' gauge, Previously part of

Hornby's main range, it has been cascaded into RailRoad for 2018.

The new model is being released as former Chiltern Railways unit 121034 in BR green with small yellow warning panels and high-

intensity headlights (Cat No. R3665), as it was in service until May 2017. The model features the same drive mechanism as previous releases, NEM coupling pockets with small tension locks and comes equipped with an 8-pin DCC decoder socket. Delivery is expected in August 2018 with a price of £69.99 for the Class 121.

The decoders are priced at £41.99 each with the Class 20 chip connected to a 40mm x 20mm speaker and the Crosti to a 28mm round speaker. 8-pin plugs are provided on both.

The Class 20 has 24 sound functions including engine sounds, manual notching of the engine sound, cold start override, horns, coupling and more while the Crosti has 18 functions ranging from exhaust sounds to whistles, manual coasting, coal shovelling, injectors and guard's whistles.

Hornby is expecting the first two Class 87 Bo-Bo AC overhead electric locomotives to arrive with its retailers during May. Modelling 87035 *Robert Burns* in BR blue (Cat No. R3580) and 87010 *King Arthur* in InterCity colours (R3582), the DCC ready locomotives with directional lighting are priced at £170.99 each. A third version, announced in the 2018 catalogue as 87019 *Sir Winston Churchill* in Virgin Trains red and black, is due for release in July (R3656).



Rails commissions all-new TERRIER' FOR 100'


HE LONDON, Brighton & South Coast Railway Stroudley 'Terrier' 0-6-0T is the latest ready-to-run' OO' gauge locomotive to be commissioned by retailer Rails of Sheffield. The announcement comes just four weeks after it revealed it would be producing the Caledonian Railway '812' 0-6-0 for 'OO' (HM130).

The 'Terrier' is being made by Dapol for Rails and six of the first batch of seven will be available through Rails and Dapol while the seventh will be an exclusive product for the National Railway Museum through www.locomotionmodels.com

The new 'OO' gauge 'Terrier' will reflect both original 'A1' and later 'A1X' 0-6-0Ts as well as Isle of Wight operated locomotives. Tooling will include two cabs and bunkers, two smokeboxes, two boilers, wooden and metal brake rigging and options for DCC ready, DCC fitted and DCC sound fitted models with a Next18 decoder provided. Sound equipped locomotives will have Dapol's RealDrive braking control with Dapol's own recordings of 32678 on the Kent and East Sussex Railway (KESR).

Planned for release in 2019, and with decorated samples expected in time for Warley in November 2018, the locomotives selected for the first batch are 'A1' 82 Boxhill in Stroudley improved engine green with a gloss finish for the National Railway Museum (Cat No. 4S-NRM-001) together with 82 Boxhill in the same livery without a gloss finish (4S-010-001), 'A1' Bodiam in KESR blue (4S-010-002), 'A1X' 751 in South Eastern and Chatham Railway colours (4S-010-003), 'A1X' 2644 in Southern lined green (4S-010-004), 'A1X' 32655 in BR lined black with early crests (4S-010-005) and 'A1X' 32661 in BR black with late crests (4S-010-006).

DCC ready models will cost £110, DCC fitted £140 and DCC sound fitted £239.



HUO decoration sample debuts

Accurascale has received decorated samples of its first 'OO' gauge ready-to-run wagon – the BR HUO 24.5ton hopper. The initial samples represent vehicles lettered with 'Load only to Stella North or South Dunston or Blyth Power Stations' with



four further triple packs being produced with different livery details. Accurascale also says these samples feature correction of the NEM pocket height and brake gear and that delivery is on track for the second quarter of 2018.

Dapol plans Gloucester 122 next for 'O'

The Gloucester Class 122 singlecar Diesel Multiple Unit (DMU) has been announced by Dapol for production in 'O' gauge as a ready-to-run model. The manufacturer is also developing the Class 121 for the scale.

The Class 122 is to feature a die-cast chassis, dual motorised bogies, DCC fitted and sound fitted options, separate handrails, three buffer types, three exhausts, different roofs, independent lighting in the cab, passenger and guard compartments and a multi-speaker factory fitted sound system on board.

Five versions are planned initially with prices starting at £299 for a DCC ready model and rising to £454 for a sound equipped model. The units will be 55002 in BR blue and grey (Cat No. 7D-015-001), 55000 in BR green



with 'speed whiskers' (7D-015-002), 55012 in Regional Railways colours (7D-015-003), 55006 in BR blue (7D-015-004) and 55004

in BR green with small yellow warning panels (7D-015-005).

The first engineering samples are currently being evaluated by

Dapol with delivery expected in the fourth quarter of 2018.

O&K HOPPER FOR 'OO'

Dapol has announced that it will release a model of the Orenstein & Koppel (O&K) JHA bogie aggregate hoppers hauled by Class 59s from Mendip stone quarries in 'OO' gauge for release in the fourth quarter of 2018.

The wagons are operated in fixed rakes consisting of two outer wagons with buffers and inner wagons without buffers. Dapol is to produce four outer and six inner wagons with prices set at

£55 for outers and £45 for inners. The model specification includes a die-cast chassis, sprung buffers on outer wagons, close coupling mechanism, a working tail lamp (directional on analogue and decoder operated on DCC).

All models will be released in Foster Yeoman livery with each of the vehicles featuring a unique running number.







Originally planned as a tribute to the Semenat & Denset railway this '00'

Originally planned as a tribute to the Somerset & Dorset railway, this 'OO' exhibition layout ultimately found itself set firmly in Southern Region third-rail territory, as **HARRY POLLARD** explains.



T WAS AROUND 15 YEARS AGO that club members within a group who had built and successfully exhibited their first small 'OO' gauge club layout sought to build something larger. The desire was to run trains of near scale length through realistic scenery. Digital Command Control (DCC) was becoming a much more workable alternative, so the group put together a proposal, submitted it to the committee and after some discussion and budgeting work, it was agreed.

The intent was to present a station and goods yard on a busy main line at a location where a branch line came in. The time period planned was to be towards the end of steam on BR. A rural location was settled upon and Southwick became an imaginary station situated a couple of miles from a market town somewhere in Southern England. This then drifted westwards towards the Somerset & Dorset as some members have a keen interest in the line.

For a while that plan stayed firm, but in the last couple of years the theme has drifted again, back towards the Southern Region. Initially third-rail was only installed on the branch line enabling such things as 2-BILs, 2-HALs and 2-EPBs to appear. This proved popular with visitors at shows and the members liked the operational mixtures. It became so popular that third-rail has been added to the main lines as well, placing the layout firmly in Southern England.


LAYOUT DESIGN

The planning stage took three to four years as quite a few track plans were considered, drawn up, discussed at length and then discarded. However, the result is as seen on the plan. The overall size of 18ft x 10ft was dictated by the space available in our then club premises. We were the sole occupants of those premises, so we were fortunate to be able to keep the layout fully assembled during construction. Once club members had built the baseboards, laid the track and almost finished the electrics, we were dealt a heavy blow when the local council decided to redevelop our club rooms and we had to find new premises for our club meetings.

The enforced move slowed our progress considerably, as due to the uncertainty little activity took place for nearly four years. Not knowing what size of space we could end up with made it unwise to do too much work which could have been abortive. We eventually found new premises with a reasonable amount of space. However, it is a shared location and other activities take place there and the layout cannot now be left up and must be packed away after each of our weekly meetings.

We are fortunate in having a member who runs a local model shop who does occasionally have space available on a temporary basis and one winter we were able to have the layout up for a few months before our annual club exhibition in Maidenhead. Members worked hard against the deadline and, after negotiating>>>





with the club treasurer, did wonders with the buildings and scenics to get the layout ready for its first public outing. At this stage it became a project for the whole club with many members constructing the various buildings while others worked on the dioramas such as the scrapyard, country pub and elements of the goods yard which were later installed on the layout.

The baseboards are of plywood construction which gives rigidity without too much weight. The boards are boxed together in pairs face to face for storage and transport. This protects the scenery and trackwork. The legs are essentially softwood and slot into the boards. It does save weight when moving the boards but is not ideal when erecting and dismantling the layout.

There are eight 4ft x 2ft boards in total (five for the scenic section) with two 3ft square scenic boards at the viewing corners. The storage yard comprises two more 3ft square corner boards and three more of the 4ft x 2ft boards to complete the circuit. This provides a central operating well measuring 14ft x 6ft.

The track is all Peco code 75 on the scenic section with some code 100 in the off scene yard. Turnouts on the scenic front are all fitted with slow action point motors. The track is laid on foam for quiet running and is ballasted.

The storage yard originally used solenoid motors which are generally reliable, but the shock of them thumping over many times during a show does take its toll on the code 75 points. The points have been replaced with new code 75 points and the motors have been replaced with servo motor driven units. These have a much gentler action which will result

in fewer issues in this area. This has entailed changing the DCC system which operates these points from a pulsed supply to modules suitable for servos.

DIGITAL CONTROL

The first trains ran before we had to move clubrooms some while back. As we progressed there were alignment and levelling issues, but these were relatively minor, if a bit fiddly to resolve. The test running proved to be a learning curve for many of our members as they familiarised themselves with DCC technology.

As we progressed there were some minor changes as we gained experience in operating. We did make a few small changes to the track plan to improve matters. We began with a Lenz DCC system, but recent advances in DCC technology have seen us upgrade to a Z21 wireless system. Much of the underlying DCC control of the points uses the MERG units. This setup has worked very well and with experienced operators the trains run regularly. The layout has and does deliver that which was intended in the initial design - it is great fun to operate and always seems to receive favourable comments at model railway exhibitions.

Several members were involved in working out just how to set out the scenic views to best advantage. This involved learning new techniques and >>>






trying to get a feeling of depth to the baseboards. Recently we have added lighting to the buildings and Southwick station building and platforms. This is very effective in low light conditions.

The operational pattern that we wanted to achieve has, we feel, succeeded. There are not too many exhibition layouts where you can just watch the trains go past! We enjoy seeing full length trains running through the countryside and station. We aim to not let the same train circulate for repeated circuits, changing trains regularly to keep the attention of watchers at shows.

We are particularly pleased with the overall scenic effect. We like to see properly weathered trains curving through the station. When a 'West Country' 4-6-2 heads a train to the coast with a summer Saturday special it looks and sounds rather impressive.

We have a mixture of operational and non-operational kit-built signals on the layout. This is currently undergoing a

but it must be said that some of us have a soft spot for Bulleid 'Pacifics'. At a recent show outing we had 19 on the layout, all with differing names, numbers and condition of weathering.

We operate the layout with the two main lines running a variety of express passenger, local passenger and freight trains passing and stopping. The branch usually runs EMUs to and fro with the occasional freight appearing and being shunted in the yard before either running out onto the main line or returning up the branch. The storage yard is always busy, and consideration is being given to enlarging it to give a wider variety of trains in service.

We sometimes load one of the new mini cameras on a flat wagon and arrange for the view to be seen on a small screen above the layout. This always causes a lot of interest as it gives a very different view of the layout and its scenery.

ON SHOW

The layout has been very beneficial to the club as our members have learned many skills in all aspects of model making. We have also progressed considerably with our understanding of DCC.

We have found that exhibiting the layout to the public and talking to them has given us enormous satisfaction and we hope to be able to continue with that aim. Southwick has always been intended as an exhibition layout and has been seen both at our main club exhibition in January at Cox Green, Maidenhead and at our summer show in Knowl Hill. It has been to several local exhibitions and more recently it has been seen at the Woking show and the High Wycombe show. There are other invitations in prospect including the Great Electric Train Show on October 13/14 2018 and we are looking forward to it becoming more widely known.

Many club members have been involved over the years in both design and construction, initially with the baseboards and later in making specific buildings, signals, woodwork, electrics and providing rolling stock. Currently the main two members are Harry Pollard and Tony Dearlove who are assisted by other club members when exhibiting or working on the layout.

Hopefully Southwick will be around for a while yet. Its next show will be at our club's summer exhibition in Knowl Hill on June 9. The club is celebrating its 50th birthday this year so hopefully Southwick can promote this and get about to a lot more shows in the near future. However, the club does have other projects underway. We have sizeable projects underway in 'O' and 'N' gauges. There is also a smaller 'HO' American switching layout in progress. A couple of other projects are in the development stage. Some of the club members have their own exhibition layouts and we all help each other out at shows and with various projects.

ELECTRO-

TIM SHACKLETON sees the super-detailing potential in Hornby's ever-popular Class 73,

MALL UGLY ENGINES tend to make great models and there's no better example than the Class 73 electrodiesel. First introduced in ready-to-run form by Lima in 1986, the model has been in continuous production ever since. Hornby bought Lima in 2004 and gave the model's motor bogie a much-needed upgrade, but the underlying quality of the basic model – now supplied 8-pin Digital Command Control (DCC)-ready as part of the RailRoad range – still shines through after three decades (HM129).

Like the model, the class itself enjoys exceptional longevity. Half the remain in front-line service – most of them with GB Railfreight – but old timers such as 'King Arthur' 4-6-0s, 'T9' 4-4-0s and Beattie '0298s' were still hard at work on the Southern Region when the first electro-diesels – capable of working off the third-rail electric supply or a 600hp English Electric diesel engine - arrived in 1962.

The first RailRoad release is E6002 in Southern green without warning panels, a style that was

obsolete by the mid-1960s. While the bodyshell details are substantially accurate for the Class 73/0 variant – encompassing E6001-E6006 – the underframe and bogie mouldings are still Lima's one-size-fits-all generic 'ED' chassis, which in matters of detail is only about 50% accurate for a Class 73/0. Some may say it's close enough - but it doesn't take much to do the necessary and to make further improvements along the way.

As far as the bodywork is concerned, there's little to be done. Lima was always good at fine pattern-making and in terms of detail the Class 73 bodyshell was one of its best. They were sold by the bucket load too, so there are plenty of second-hand versions out there too.

You could, if you wanted to, cut off the moulded handrails and replace them with wire (remembering that the handrails were a flat section rather than round) or you might flushglaze the windows using a LaserGlaze kit from Shawplan. For a layout locomotive rather than a glass-case specimen, however, I didn't feel either was necessary. I'll focus my energies instead on

the underframes and also the livery elements.

Lima was the first mainstream manufacturer to take advantage of new paint-room technology and offer a large range of livery options across comparatively short production runs - a useful facility to have, given the extraordinary range of brandings the '73s' have carried over the years. Since the Lima and Hornby body mouldings are identical, I thought it would be interesting to take a second Hornby chassis and rework it as a Class 73/1 so it could be fitted, as the mood took me, with a selection of spare bodies in different colour schemes that I've acquired cheaply over the years. This isn't rocket-science modelling – I've deliberately held back from anything too involved – but it does open up fresh possibilities and broaden the modelling options available to you without breaking the bank. With ready-to-run models costing well over £100 these days, anything that can reduce this figure has to be worth thinking about.

STEP BY STEP

DETAILING AND CUSTOMISING HORNBY AND LIMA CLASS 73s




I was astonished at the visual transformation made by extending the wiper arms upwards with two tiny squares of styrene glued to the white window surround and painted black. All of a sudden the wipers – integrally moulded as part of the glazing, and semi-invisible – really stand out. At the same time a spot of black paint on the ends of the air horns gives the illusion of hollowness.

Right: Extra multiple unit cables (on right) from a ViTrains Class 37, multiple-working socket (left) from a Heljan Class 47. The latter was thinned in depth so it would better match the Hornby version on the right. The ViTrains cable was reversed to correspond with the symmetrical arrangement of the prototype. Ideally such parts should be pinned and glued in place. This would be a good point to add more convincing lamp irons using 10 thou styrene strip or etched brass.









Capturing the look of newish translucent panels on a solid plastic roof is quite a challenge. After masking off the surrounding areas, I sprayed a thin coat of Railmatch Executive Light Grey (200) followed by a gentle misting with two MiG Ammo washes – Medium Tan (1606) and Tan Grey (1610). Over time these panels weathered to a brownish shade.



Left: Hornby's motor bogie is a vast improvement over Lima's 'pancake' mechanism —after an extended running-in session it really does run like a good 'un. The Lima chassis in the foreground has been retro-fitted with a kit-built High Level LoRider motor bogie, eight-wheel pick-up and a lot of extra weight. It runs beautifully but a lot of work was involved.

The Hornby chassis on its way to becoming a '73/0' – as supplied its details are very much those of a '73/1'. The governing factor is the large steel ballast weight at the centre, so the upgrade basically involves chopping off unwanted bits of material so it looks less like a plastic box to hold the weight and more like a locomotive underframe.





The relief detail is on a separate moulding that's lightly glued to the chassis. You might find it easier to separate the components (assuming they're not too well glued) and work on them flat. It's a soft plastic so I cut out many of the webs using a sharp blade, finishing with an emery board. This enhancement makes the underframe far more three-dimensional.



Like many diesel and electric era modellers I've accumulated a mass of underframe detailing parts left over from other projects that could be useful for the Class 73s.


Right: Other components for the chassis upgrade were bought in – cast buffers (two patterns) from Lanarkshire Models & Supplies and etched steps from PH Designs.

Cabling for the bogies is best made from Alan Gihson's 0.33mm wire. Much of it involves a double thickness soldered together for strength. It can then be painted white prior to installation. Paradoxically. it will then be weathered



The as-supplied underframe moulding is fairly accurate for a Class 73/1 but you can still improve its appearance by cutting away some of the surplus webs to give the illusion of depth. The cable runs on a Vulcan Foundry-built locomotive seem simpler and neater than on the Eastleigh-built equivalents. Among other differences, these locomotives had round Oleo buffers from new.








The two project locomotives side by side. Weathering is concentrated on the underframes – using the usual airbrushed LifeColor acrylics from the 'Rail Weathering' sets – and the roofs, which were entirely done by hand using MiG Ammo washes and weathering powders.





PAINT SHOP: 73135 - INTERCITY TO DEPARTMENTAL GREY

• The range of liveries carried by electro-diesels is enormous – and it's still growing. I've always liked the look of Departmental Grey – drab, austere, uninspiring, supremely workaday. Lima offered two Class 73s in these non-colours but I particularly wanted to portray one Lima didn't do – 73135, which lacked high-intensity headlights in its


departmental days. Previously in InterCity 'large logo' livery – it was delivered in BR blue as E6042 in 1966 – it went grey in 1990 and almost immediately was repainted into InterCity 'Swallow' scheme. Eventually it became Gatwick Express 73235 before acquiring South West Trains' vibrant house colours – quite a contrast to its spell in the engineers' fleet!




As a rule I prefer to remove as much as possible of the existing livery prior to repainting – stripes, numbers, nameplates and ownership markings show up in relief under fresh paint. Although it's expensive, SuperStrip from Phoenix Precision is the best paint stripper I know. A strong household cleaner such as Fairy Power spray will do the job but it'll take much longer.



Using a foil container and an old toothbrush, SuperStrip gets down to work immediately. It's also safe to use on plastic models. Be sure to wear hand and eye protection and work with effective ventilation — if possible I go outdoors!





CLASSES 73/0 AND 73/1-



The first of the class was E6001, delivered from Eastleigh in February 1962 and seen here at Hither Green on 23 September that year. This south London depot was always one of the electro-diesels' main operational bases. The locomotive is in plain green livery with oval buffers. It doesn't yet have bogie-mounted sandboxes.

So how can you tell the two sub-classes apart? At first, the most obvious variations related to livery. The first locomotive, E6001, came in plain mid-green with small yellow warning panel. The next five, E6002-E6006, carried a brighter green with a grey stripe (edged white) along

the bottom of the bodyside. All six had the circular BR 'carriage' emblem and acquired warning panels in the mid-1960s.

The second batch, E6007-E6013, were delivered new in an early version of BR blue, again with the grey lower bodyside stripe and warning panels. E6014

onwards were in plain BR blue with small warning panels. All the blue locomotives carried the then-new BR 'double-arrow' symbol but it was not until the 1980s that they acquired electrification warning flashes.

There were so many detail differences that the electro-

diesels were divided into two sub-classes. The first six were designated JA (later Class 73/0) and the rest were JB (later Class 73/1). The spotting feature I look for first is on the side where the large engine compartment grille on the lower bodyside is offset to the left – the '73/0s'

have an extra pair of small grilles alongside the right-hand cab. This isn't found on '73/1s' – instead, they have a single extra grille amidships that was originally aluminium-coloured. On the other side – the one with the engine-compartment grille offset to the right and a large

grille at the left-hand end – the '73/0' has an extra window cut into the bodyside immediately to the left of the double grilles. E6001-E6003 were delivered with oval buffers. All subsequent electro-diesels carried the 20in round Oleo type, to which style the first three were soon



E6008, again at Stewarts Lane, is one of the 1965-built batch that differed in several significant ways from the first six. They would set the pattern for the rest of the class, all built at English Electric's Vulcan Foundry in Newton-le-Willows. E6007-E6013 were delivered new in blue livery with yellow warning panels, but from E6014 onwards the grey band was discontinued.

modified. They have extra multiple unit sockets on the front (known to railfans as 'bagpipes') but bogie-mounted sandboxes were not fitted to this subclass when new. The fuel tank is different on the JA – it has a prominent central recess for the filler cap, whereas on the JB this

is much higher – and the cabling on the bogies appears more cluttered. The kickplates under the cab doors are chequerplate on JBs, plain on JAs. The external battery tray clips (one side only, lower body) are a late 1970s modification not found on locomotives in original condition.





Compact layouts can take a lot of detailing to bring to life. NIGEL BURKIN explains how he developed the distillery yard and scenery on this 'OO' micro layout using readily available products and materials.


OMETIMES, to avoid modelling burn-out, a break from working on a project, even one as small as the Loch Dhu Distillery project, is not a bad thing. Whilst the model may be small in size, a mere eight square feet, there's a lot of detail to squeeze into that small footprint if the distillery and exchange siding scenes are going to look convincing. It proves that a compact or micro-layout can be as challenging a project as large layouts.

After taking a longish break, I returned to the building of Loch Dhu Distillery with the intention of finishing it to exhibition standard by the end of 2017. The layout has been operated using the now two resident shunters and I foresee the arrival of a couple more. The latest addition is the Hornby Peckett 0-4-0ST which becomes *Loch Dhu No. 2*. Hatton's has added to the shopping list with its new Hunslet Barclay 0-4-0ST which is due to arrive in April (see Reviews). The track has been tweaked and eased to allow for the sharp yard curves with the assistance of Stourbridge Junction shed's 6403.

A '64XX' 0-6-0PT on a Scottish distillery layout? Yes, as unlikely as that may seem, the longish wheelbase of that particular Bachmann model was good at picking out the tight spots in the track, particularly with the sharp 1:3 ratio turnouts used in the distillery yard. With easing of check rails and track completed, I was confident that the lightweight distillery 'Pugs' would be able to potter about the yard with ease.

To complete the layout came the need to build an engine shed to service the engines which was to be based on the existing one at Dailuaine distillery. A skew arch bridge provided an important scenic break to the right side of the distillery scene where the track entered the staging area. Two low relief buildings which were added during this construction phase enhance the impression of a busy distillery yard within the miniscule footprint allowed for the scene.

As the yard work continued, the distillery buildings were adjusted to fit their foundations and finished with stone colours and weathering.

Some additional structures were needed to complete the distillery scene including a low relief building to fill the gap visible in this picture together with a retaining wall along the front of the layout. Once those structures were completed, finishing of the yard track and pavement with mud, cinders, grime, weeds and rust could commence.



The retaining wall was assembled from embossed styrene. On reflection, individual styrene blocks cut from South Eastern Finecast random stone sheet would look better – a case for some future reworking?



The organised chaos of layout building included the removal of some plaster to make room for some cobbles to add further texture around the engine shed.



Rust was applied to the sides of the rails first, and with care to see that all the metal was completely covered with paint. Lifecolor's Dust and Rust set provided the colours.

THE YARD SURFACE

The yard pavement is simulated concrete with wooden boards between most of the rails. Needless to say, the concrete pavement was not the best and soon became rough and pitted with heavy use. This is the effect represented by the layer of Woodland Scenics Hydrocal laid in the yard except where the buildings are located. Pieces of styrene strip were glued in place as formers to make foundations for the various buildings before the liquid Hydrocal was poured into the yard and levelled off. To

help with colouring, the Hydrocal mix had black poster paint mixed in to colour it grey.

One factor to consider is how to clean the rails of track embedded in concrete or fitted with wooden boards. Very simply, when finishing the pavement, make sure the surface is below the rail top and not level with it. This small detail will save a great deal of annoyance by preventing those models with wider wheel treads from catching the pavement and makes track cleaning easier without scraping pavement away.

Once happy with the top finish – it did not have to be pristine by any means - it was given a top coat of light grey acrylic paint before receiving various washes of grime using Dirty Black paint colour from the Lifecolor range. The rail edges were painted dark rust using the rust base coat from the same range. The wooden boarding placed roughly between the rails was painted grey and finished with some dull browns using a paint brush to give it a basecoat.

That did not complete the yard pavement colouring which was lightly sprayed with a blend

Excess was wiped from the top of the rails to prevent layers of paint building up on them. I was not concerned about staining the adjacent pavement at this stage.



Grime and rust was built up in thin layers over the yard pavement with Dark Grey, Rust and Sleeper Grime paint colours from the Lifecolor range.



At the opposite end of the distillery yard, an overbridge was built as a scenic break. It was built to accommodate two tracks.



The core of the bridge was constructed from 6mm plywood for strength. For greater visual interest, the road is on a gradient and the bridge itself is angled across the scene.

of Lifecolor Dark Rust colours from the Dust and Rust set along the rails including adjacent areas of the concrete paving. This was followed up with Sleeper Grime along the wooden boarding and parts of the concrete pavement itself. A final dusting with Dirty Black completed the picture - the mixes in the airbrush being prepared for subtle colouring with thin dilutions applied sparingly over a longer spraying bout. To save mess, airbrush washings (easy with acrylic paint) were discharged from the airbrush using an lwata spray-out pot.

BALLASTING AND DIRT


The unpaved area of the yard was treated with a variety of surface finishes before painting. Some fine ballast was laid before being partially covered with air dry modelling clay. Other areas received air dry clay which was worked around the sleepers to represent old cinders, mud and general dirt which had accumulated in the yard. Sleepers were painted to represent ageing, grimed timber with sleeper grime.


Mud and cinder surfaces were painted with mixes of Lifecolor paint including the Dark

Rust basecoat, Dirty Black and anything else that would create the desired grime and dirt. Experimentation is worthwhile before tackling the job on the layout to be sure the desired result is obtained. It's fun doing this sort of modelling. All manner of results can be achieved with acrylic paints and powders such as those from the MiG range. You won't need a lot to achieve some great effects.

Another way to achieve some texture in yard areas where ballast is lacking or has succumbed to years of dirt is to mix a little >>>









Before sowing weeds and grass, the track, ballast and surrounding surfaces are dirtied with grime, rust and mud colours applied through an airbrush.



Once the paint was dry, a blend of Woodland Scenics fine turf was applied to selected parts of the scene. A thin layer of undiluted Mod Podge was applied before the fine turf was blown into place.

2mm long static grass was applied to areas of the track and was followed up with 4mm long grass on the embankment and away from the track itself. The desired impression is one of poor maintenance and neglect. The grass was secured with matte medium applied through an airbrush.



Once the grasses were in place, a further light layer to increase the grass length or to add dead-coloured grasses was applied over the matte medium sprayed over the grass surface with an airbrush. This also removes shine and helps glue the grass fibres in place.






Matting down was completed with Testors Dullcote to remove shine from the static grass and yard surfaces together with the track.





A smattering of debris was added to the yard scene including cask staves, old lids and bent hoops. Shrubs, weed and bushes were then added to complete the scene.





Use bushes and undergrowth to conceal joins between different structures and to make them appear embedded in the scenery. Woodland Scenics Hydrocal in your acrylic paint mixes until they become thickened. The mix may be applied with a paintbrush over hard pavements as well as other areas and provides a little more texture which holds paint washes really well.

To finish the unpaved yard area, an airbrush was used to apply thin coats or dustings of dirty black to places where the engines would stand for a while, have the fire dropped or be loaded with sacks of coal. Other areas, particularly the sleepers, were given a final application of sleeper grime from the Lifecolor Rail Weathering pack.

WEEDS AND GRASSES

With neglect comes weeds and grasses in unpaved areas of the yard. No one is around to dig them up from the muddy cinder ballast allowing nature to invade the track a little in places. Clearly, you do not want long grasses in between the rails just in case they interfere with the running of models, particularly the small tank engines. I started by applying a thin layer of blended

Although this scene appears finished, it could be further enhanced with some long dry grasses and a little more debris and weathering – but not too much. The bushes and shrubs are coloured to represent early autumn after a first frost in the glens has started to turn leaves a rusty colour.



Woodland Scenics fine turf to various parts of the track, the cess and yard surface.

This was followed up with MiniNatur 2mm long static grass in Late Fall colours. Short grasses will create the desired effect without causing problems with running. The adjacent embankment and yard received longer grasses and was finished with some fine turf to represent weeds.

The first layer of grass was applied to dilute Mod Podge glue and finished off with thinned acrylic matte medium applied through an airbrush. A spray of matte medium allowed a further shot of grass fibres to be applied to make some longer grasses, created texture in the existing grass by blowing it over a little in places; killed off the shine and acted as an adhesive to hold it all together.

SHRUBS AND TREES

A common trick used to disguise the joins between structures such as bridges, retaining walls and the gap at the bottom of structures is to use shrubs and bushes. I used my favourite method of creating shrubs by applying Noch

leaves and Woodland Scenics fine turf to Woodland Scenics Poly Fibre using Scenic Cement or acrylic matte medium. To add some autumn colour, the ends of the finished bush leaves were touched in with some rust colours including brown, orange and yellow, leaving some of the other leaves untouched. An airbrush could be used to achieve the same effect.

FINISHING OFF

Concluding the yard scene, particularly the unpaved area, was simple - some debris from wagon loads, a discarded cask or two from the distillery together with old staves and hoops, tucked in around the shrubbery and grasses together with the odd item of railway hardware adds character without overdoing the detail level. Remember, in finishing a layout, less is very often more – a greater impact can be achieved with a few well placed items than overcrowding the scene.

This latest round of modelling leaves just some small details, finishing and the final preparation of rolling stock and wagons. Watch this space for the final instalment.







RAMBLETON Model Railway Club is located in Harpenden, Hertfordshire. It can trace its history back to the late 1940s but was officially formed on January 1 1956 by a group of local schoolboys looking for somewhere to run their clockwork trains. Not content with running on the living room carpet, they set about finding a suitable outdoor location where they could create a sizable railway.

A site was soon found, and track laying commenced. Running mainly Hornby clockwork trains naturally meant 'O' gauge was adopted. In those days, track was not mass produced like it is today and had to be hand built. It was a time-consuming

business, rewarded with some quite intricate crossings and pointwork, produced mainly by boys not much older than 12 years old. Running sessions were popular and the membership grew. The track didn't stay down long as a move to a new site was forced upon the club. Rebuilding started at a new location, but again this proved to be temporary as the land was needed for a housing development.

The club finally settled into its present location in the early 1960s, which is a triangular wood bordered by three railway cuttings, two of which are disused with the third being the busy Midland Main Line. With plenty of space to utilise, ambitious track plans were drawn up.

Eventually a design was agreed on and building commenced. It was a major engineering project for such a small and young workforce with tons of earth to shift, concrete to mix and brick walls to erect. The end result was one of the largest 'O' gauge outdoor model railways in the country.

Everything was designed with ease of train operation in mind. The nine stations are strategically placed to be the right distance apart for the duration of a wound clockwork spring. The trackbed at stations is at waist height so there is no need to bend down and the main station is a brick built shed which the line passes through, allowing stock to be added or removed easily.

SIGNALLING THE LINE

With such a large railway, some form of signalling was required, so each station was equipped with redundant British Rail block instruments allowing station operators to communicate with neighbouring stations using special bell codes to avoid collisions - in theory at least! Signalling courses were run by professional railwaymen to teach members how to operate the railway correctly culminating with an exam and presentation of a certificate for those that passed.

During the summer months, running sessions took place twice a week utilising the club's large collection of clockwork locomotives and rolling stock from manufacturers like Hornby, Bassett-Lowke and Bing. There were even a few live steam meths-fired Bowman engines that the older members could operate. The 1970s saw the introduction of the battery powered Tri-ang 'Hymek' diesel. Although designed primarily as a children's toy, it was a very detailed representation of the locomotive and could be easily modified and painted to produce an acceptable model, so much so that they are still used today.

As time went by, the handmade track deteriorated and suffered vandal attacks making large sections unusable. The quickest and easiest way to replace it was with off-the-shelf Peco nickel silver flexible track. One of the drawbacks of this was that the flanges on the clockwork and tinplate stock were too deep to run smoothly on the new track. Some were rewheeled but most were put aside to be replaced by Tri-ang stock and the expanding range of British outline Lima models.

As Brambleton has no power supply, apart from car batteries to run the signalling block instruments, the Lima engines, mainly the '4F' 0-6-0s and Class 33 diesels, needed to be converted to run on batteries rather than pick up through the rails. A forward/reverse switch is prominently located on the side of the engines making it easy for operators of all ages to control.

Heljan's introduction to the ready-torun 'O' gauge market has seen many of its products converted to battery-radio

controlled operation by members. By using the latest 2.4GHz radio technology and sophisticated electronic speed controllers you can produce a locomotive that is extremely smooth, reliable and easy to control even when shunting.

The track is pinned down onto recycled plastic boards which are screwed down onto a concrete base. The boards have a covering of roofing felt for cosmetic purposes. The station areas have plywood boards, but these are gradually being replaced with the plastic type. Like the early days, all the pointwork is hand-built but now using copper-clad sleepers and Peco rail. They are all manually controlled and most have movable wing rails to accommodate coarse scale wheelsets.

LIVE STEAM

The Mamod live steam locomotive proved irresistible to some members, although it was out of gauge with limited route availability on the original 'O' gauge network. It provided a welcome change from the whirring sound of an electric motor and produced the spectacle of real steam. The big drawback came with the type of fuel used to heat the water. The solid fuel tablets, although effective at boiling the water, tended to crumble and drop from beneath the locomotive onto the track. This intense heat would melt the sleepers and roofing felt, burning with an invisible flame which made it

difficult to spot before the damage was done. Much to the disappointment of the Mamod owners, these types of locomotive were banned. The solution was to build a line suitable for live steam operation.

To accompany the 'O' gauge layout, the club now has an extensive network of 'SM32' - 16mm:1ft scale models running on 32mm gauge garden railway track. This was conceived by the head of the Permanent Way Department to alleviate the constant need to replace plastic sleepers that had been burnt on the main line sections.

An interesting trackplan was devised incorporating bridges, tunnels and a spiral. The track to be used was the chunky, narrow gauge outline Peco 'SM32', which is ideally suited to use with live steam. This was agreed on by the club committee and as it was fast approaching the club's 40^{th} anniversary, the project was to be known as the Ruby Line. It was to be connected to the 'O' gauge line at two places, allowing standard gauge stock to run onto the new line too.

Work commenced in late 1995 with the route surveyed, cleared and marked with wooden stakes. These were driven >>> into the ground at the correct height for the track base allowing for the differing gradients, the steepest being the spiral at 1-in-40. It was quite a challenge to build as the line had to twice pass under the main footpath into the site and twice cross over the 'O' gauge main line.

The line was completed in the summer of 1996 - much to the relief of the Mamod operators. It proved popular with Brambleton members and those of other organisations, so much so that the need to >>>

expand was soon talked about. Again, an ambitious track plan was devised with the result being the Millennium Line, built to mark that occasion. It can be operated separately or joined to the Ruby Line by an array of link lines creating a giant loop or figure of eight along with numerous other route possibilities. It offers 80 yards of level track with sweeping curves and a large junction station which doubles up as a covered steaming up area. With the ever-increasing popularity of 16mm scale, this line too was soon running at capacity, so an extension was constructed in time for the club's 60th anniversary. The new Jubilee Line adds another circuit complete with deep cuttings, a tunnel, two large bridges and a covered steaming up area.

The method of construction for the 'SM32' line is to dig a trench about a foot wide following the route, being careful not to disturb the wooden stakes. The depth depends on the surrounding terrain: clearly if the line is to be level and the terrain rises, the trench will be deeper. The bottom of the trench is filled with about six inches of crushed hardcore then approximately five inches of concrete poured in. Lightweight concrete blocks (215mm x 440mm) are then laid upright in a line and allowed to sink in the concrete until level with the nearby stake. The joints between blocks are filled with mortar after the concrete has dried. If the line rises more than the height of a block above ground level, shuttering is used to retain the concrete. If there is a significant curve, the blocks are cut to a suitable length before laying and canted slightly as they are being positioned in the concrete. The 'SM32' track is pinned directly onto the top surface of the blocks using 1in steel panel pins. The lightweight blocks readily accept small nails and hold them tight.

A typical running session on the 'SM32' line will see a variety of live steam locomotives from manufacturers like Roundhouse and Accucraft along with home-built examples and even the occasional Mamod. The majority are radio controlled fuelled by gas, but the intricacies of coal firing are gaining in popularity. The simplicity of a diesel

outline battery electric locomotive appeals to many and complements the live steam locomotives. The rolling stock can vary from a full rake of Ffestiniog bogie coaches to a few slate wagons.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

The club welcomes any individual or organisation who would like to use their facilities. It enjoys a close relationship with the West Herts Area Group of the 16mm Association which meets once a month at the layout throughout the year and assists with the club's two annual public open days in May and September.

Generally, the 'O' gauge line is available for use from April until October with maintenance and upgrades taking place the rest of the year. The 'SM32' line is used regularly all year round, culminating in the popular New Year's Eve steam-up.


Being an industrial locomotive fan, I was very pleased to purchase the April edition of *Hornby Magazine*.







ACCUITASCA MEETS... ACCUITASCA EMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPERTY

One of a new generation of model railway manufacturers entering the British market, Accurascale has its roots in Ireland, where it also produces ready-to-run models of Irish prototypes.

BEN JONES met Fran Burke and Patrick Conboy to find out more about their plans.

STHE UK MODEL RAILWAY market and mass production techniques have changed over the last decade, we've become used to new suppliers popping up to offer niche products overlooked by the established manufacturers. The newest name is Accurascale, which made its UK debut in early 2018 with the announcement of a 'OO' gauge model of a BR HUO 24.5ton hopper wagon.

From the outset, Accurascale has been notable for its adoption of modern social media and marketing techniques that allow it to interact directly with its customers and potential customers. This has allowed it to tailor its products to the requirements of modellers and deliver models that promise to set new benchmarks for quality and detail.

However, this is not the first ready-to-run model project for the quartet of Irishmen behind the Accurascale brand. They also trade as Irish Railway Models, which has quickly developed a strong reputation by producing superb models of Irish freight wagons over the last two years.

At the recent Model Rail Scotland event in Glasgow I met up with Fran Burke and Patrick Conboy who, along with Steven McCarron and Richard O'Hanrahan, own the two brands and are now pursuing their 'dream job' full-time.

STARTING POINT

Away from the bustle of the show, I ask Fran and Patrick how they got started in the hobby and what led them to start their own model railway business.

"Like most people, we've been interested in trains since we were kids," says Fran. "I started with 'Thomas the Tank Engine' and then got

a Hornby HST as my first train set. Later I also got my first 'Irish' train set with a Lima Class 33 and some repainted Mk 2 coaches."

"I used to watch pairs of Irish Rail '141s' shunting liner trains at my local station in Longford" continues Patrick. "My first train set was a Hornby Class 25 and some wagons. But it was the BBC series *Railwatch* (broadcast in 1990) that really got both of us interested in British railways as well."

"Then in the 1990s Paddy Murphy took a chance and established a market for Irish models, firstly with Lima models and later with his own tooling – without him we wouldn't be sitting here today," adds Fran.

"We're moderators for the *IrishRailwayModeller.* com forum and a few years ago we were discussing the possibility of producing some suitable wagons to run with the Murphy Models'141'Class diesels.

"We considered wagons with some commonality of parts that were widely used over many years and eventually chose the four-wheel ballast hopper and cement 'bubble' as the best candidates in 2015."

Patrick continues: "Initially we used a middle man as we didn't have the skills or the contacts at that time. However, progress on the ballast hoppers was very slow. By December 2016 we were having problems and decided to take the project in-house. After that, things moved on rapidly and by April 2017 we had the first deliveries of production wagons.

"By that stage we were already well advanced on the 'bubbles' and, learning lessons from the first wagon, we persuaded our factory to design and build it to much finer tolerances. As a result we had to scrap some of the tooling, which cost money, but we felt it was worth it."

Fran interjects: "We were determined to do it right. The difference in cost between doing it to a price and 'doing it right' is actually very small.

"Short production runs mean a premium price and we felt that the models should justify that additional cost. Our direct sales model helps to keep the cost down and offer better value for money.

"Since April 2017 we've sold 2,500 ballast hoppers and 77% of the 4,500 cement 'bubbles' which arrived last October. That demonstrated to us that there is a market for top quality Irish wagons in 4mm scale. Next will be the Tara Mines bogie ore wagon and we've now announced six more products for release over the next couple of years. The ballast plough, fertiliser wagon, 42ft container flat with Guinness kegs, spoil wagons and weedspray vehicles will complement various existing IRM and Murphy models.

"Our Irish customers, most of whom we know by name, told us that they needed time to save so that they didn't miss out on our products, so we took the decision to announce them as a batch in advance. Normally, we like to ensure that a model is in tooling before we unveil it," explains Fran.

TAKING THE PLUNGE

With such an ambitious 'to do' list on the Irish side, what convinced the pair to give up their day jobs, go full-time with IRM, and take on the added workload of producing British models?

"By February last year we were both

considering going
full-time, but the Irish
market isn't big enough to
sustain it", says Patrick. "So, with our
longstanding interest in UK railways, we
decided to investigate if we could use our
skills to produce models of British subjects."

Fran continues: "We felt we could offer a premium product at a price equivalent to, or even less than, those offered by the established manufacturers.

"As with the Irish wagons, we looked at where the gaps were, and chose the BR HUO hopper. Around 5,000 were built and used from the 1950s until the 1980s, but there was no ready-to-run model and, importantly, there was a survivor we could survey."

Patrick adds: "We visited the Tanfield Railway in October 2017 and spent several hours measuring and photographing every inch of the last intact HUO. We took more than 600 photographs!

"Our big advantage is that we can do our CAD locally, rather than it being done in the Far East and being subject to the inherent problems of long-distance communication.

As a result, we got our first HUO engineering prototype in the second week of February, three-and-half months after the initial survey."

What has the response been like from British modellers?

"The reaction has been hugely positive. Some people knew us already from Irish Railway Models (60% of its models are sold to UK customers) and were aware of the quality of the product. Modellers are drawn to the 'ordinariness' of the HUO and attracted by a quality product at a reasonable price," says Patrick.

"We want to reduce lead times," adds Fran. "We won't announce intentions; we will only announce products when they are around two months away from release. It's very frustrating otherwise.

"We're being open and honest, as we have been with IRM. It's vital that we keep talking to people and keep them updated >>>

on our progress. Engagement through social media, shows and the specialist magazines is an essential part of what we do."

Having broken through with the HUO, what's next for Accurascale?

Being careful not to give too much away, Fran says: "We're looking to launch four or five British models in 2018. We're not confined to 4mm scale and we're always exploring new markets and opportunities to create a diverse range, but it takes time.

"The only limiting factor at the moment is our ability to get material out to China. We're looking to grow, and recruit people so that we can increase our output."

DRIVING ENTHUSIASM

Various model companies are promising to 'drive up standards' and 'pursue excellence', but how do Fran and Patrick plan to do things differently? Fran immediately responds: "We'd like to bring

Fran immediately responds: "We'd like to bring some of the excitement and enthusiasm back to the hobby. It feels a bit jaded at the moment.

"On a practical level, we're looking at things such as using higher quality motors and improved drive trains, plus refinements to DCC sound. We want to maximise the features available and, for example, we have some ideas for improving the haulage capacity of steam locomotives, which can be disappointing at the moment.

Patrick adds: "We also want to encourage finescale modelling so that it doesn't die out. Our Irish models are designed to accept 21mm gauge wheelsets (for 5ft 3in gauge Irish finescale) and we felt it was important to do the same for 'EM' and 'P4' modellers in the UK. We've engaged with the EM Gauge and Scalefour societies and designed the HUO to be easy to convert. With good planning and



design, it costs nothing and will hopefully persuade a few people to try finescale."

All too soon our time is up as it's time for Patrick and Fran to catch a flight home to Dublin. As we part, Fran says: "If you'd asked us three years ago, we would have been very surprised to be where we are now."


Patrick adds: "Doing our hobby as a job is a dream come true. As enthusiasts, we have a passion for delivering new products, and pushing detail and quality standards forward. For both IRM and Accurascale we have 'road maps' planned out for the next few years, and we know where we want to go."



Modelling the METROPOLIS


MALCOLM BRIGGS' Southern Region branch line Knight's Hill appeared in HM87 in 2014. Shortly afterwards, he was tasked with building something altogether more urban – and for a very different reason.

ODEL RAILWAY projects start for all manner of reasons. The most common is in pursuit of a hobby, but from time to time construction can be led by completely different needs. Those of you who remember the story of my 30-year $\,$ saga to build a Southern Region North Cornwall-based layout may recall that I said I was involved in the exhibition industry. A client came to visit our offices shortly after we had won them the 'best stand' award at an exhibition. Opposite that stand was one with a model city on it. Our client had always wanted something similar and then my colleagues showed them the Knight's Hill article in Hornby Magazine.

And so the die was cast: could we build them a model city for an exhibition? We would have about six months to design, construct and install a complete split-level model town that featured working trams, trains, traffic lights, multi-storey car park and many other features - all of which had to be able to be operated by visitors from two different sides of the layout. It also had to be largely self-managing as there were to be no permanent members of staff in attendance at the exhibition.



This multi-level diorama was built for an exhibition stand to highlight the range of products available for the real world. It includes town, tram, rail and motorway levels within an 8ft \times 8ft footprint.



The city scene incorporated road, trams, railway and motorway levels with a number of individually operated lighting effects and features. Here a Manchester tram unit passes through the town scene.

The client company designs and installs control systems for infrastructure such as roads, tunnels, bridges, car parks and power transmission and this was felt to be a good way to demonstrate its capabilities. We were also limited in space to allow the model to be accommodated on display stands with a total footprint of 8ft x 8ft available.

TRAMS AND TRAINS

Starting with the tramway, we managed to create a complete dumbbell layout so that the tram could pass down the main street in one direction and then come back the other way without points or the need to reverse. This involved 10in radius curves, which was at the absolute limit of the operational design of the articulated (Manchester) tram. We later filled in all the trackwork with mounting-board to represent tarmac, but in winter conditions in the workshop this tended to rise and lift the tram wheels off the

track. We had to pin a lot of it down, but the lesson learnt was to use an inert substance such as plastic sheeting, which is not affected by climatic and humidity changes.

Half a bridge and the roadway system went in next together with miles of wiring for the lights, all of which linked back to a Control Centre which had a clear roof so you could see all the connections and TV screens lighting up as exhibition visitors pressed the operating buttons. For example, if they pressed a button for street lighting, all the overhead lights came on but the part of the Control Centre which operated that also came to life. Every circuit had a timer that limited how long it would operate.

The train system had two separate lines, each controlled by a Gaugemaster shuttle system and they just moved back and forwards independently of each other, albeit 'wrong line' running for 50% of the time.

We built the motorway system as a



separate module so that the complicated wiring could be completed off the main board. Because of the difficulty of trying to make vehicles move - and having considered a range of options but discounting them on the grounds of them needing an operator in attendance - we opted for a motorway queue caused by a vehicle fire and very little traffic on the other side. This gave us the opportunity for lots of flashing blue lights and overhead gantry signals.

A large quantity of Oxford vehicles were bought and many of them were taken apart to insert emergency lighting. I then took the whole lot home to wire it up one weekend. I'd estimated that if I started at 6pm on a Friday evening, I should be finished by about 9pm. As it happened, it took me until 5pm on the Sunday, having worked all weekend on it! 27 hours of my life disappeared into soldering thousands of connections to make it all

work, but it looked pretty impressive.

The buildings were on a grand scale. The first was an apartment block that was more than 2ft long and 1ft wide. Usual modelling techniques played no part here – this had to be solid and strong, so the sides were made of 5mm blue acrylic and the rest of the building was foamboard sprayed with a craft stone finish. The remaining buildings were built out of thick plastic sheeting or timber. The multi-storey car park was more difficult as it had little integral strength until installed on the layout.

ON DISPLAY

We finished the model about two days before it was bundled into a large van and installed on the exhibition stand at the NEC, Birmingham, where it was a great success, drawing people to it and allowing the sales staff to explain the range of services offered.

After the show, it went into store with the intention that it would be converted into a Dutch city in time for another trade show in Amsterdam the following year. However, in the intervening period the European client

company found itself in financial difficulties and parts of it were bought out by a venture capital company. It was no longer deemed appropriate for the model to represent their changed priorities and so it was broken up. We retained the motorway which has been used subsequently and we have the apartment block in the warehouse to remind us of the days when our workshop was full of models rather than exhibitions stands.

Special thanks go to Bryan Marlow who masterminded the electrical installation and helped with the modelling and also to Sue from Layouts 4U who supplied all the lights and much advice. I think she got rather fed up with me asking questions but was always helpful and responded promptly. Thoroughly recommended!





PERFORMANCE

Our sample of 5717 was equipped with Dapol's Realdrive sound file for the GWR'57XX'. This is loaded onto a Zimo MX644D decoder which in turn emits its sound through a 28mm round speaker fitted inside a sound chamber at the front of the locomotive. The speaker is positioned facing down below the chimney and while it may seem like a small point, it does make a difference to have the exhaust sound emitted from the right end of a locomotive – particularly in this scale.

Straight from the box, the sample ran smoothly and quietly (without the sound on) throughout the speed range and following a period of light engine operation we subjected it to load testing on our 'O' gauge test track with digital control. The result was that the model showed itself capable of handling a 20 wagon goods train without any difficulty – more than enough for most situations that this compact locomotive will be tasked with.


The sound decoder contains 18 sound

functions and a very realistic set of driving sounds. The exhaust sounds, turned on with Function 1, include three intensities of exhaust depending on the speed the locomotive is travelling at and how long it has been at that speed. It responds to additional acceleration like a real locomotive, with an increase in exhaust sound, settling to a guieter steam sound when cruising. Moreover, it has excellent coasting sounds too - notch back by one speed step and the exhaust cuts out to give way to motion and boiler sounds. Adjustment of the time this runs for can be made with CV285 (we set our sample to 255 to maximise the coasting sound period) which makes the locomotive highly drivable. In addition there are whistles. including a pair of effective distant whistles, coal and injector sounds, couplings, safety valve, brakes and more. It's an enthralling package which we thoroughly enjoyed operating and well worth the higher price in our view.

OVERALL

Dapol has chosen wisely with the GWR'57XX' and '8750' family. They were hard working locomotives as equally at home with a long string of goods wagons as they were with a short passenger train. They operated across the Great Western Railway and BR Western Region network from 1929 until the last was withdrawn in 1966 – 16 have been preserved – and they were even found working away from the Western at times on the Southern.

This versatility is part of the appeal of this new model, but really what makes it stand out are the new features and the sound decoder which has been produced for the locomotive. In combination the inside motion, firebox glow, real coal, stunning attention to detail and flawless performance make this new addition to the Dapol'O' gauge portfolio a force to be reckoned with. We are wholly impressed and we are sure that you will be too. Highly recommended. (MW)

turn becoming known as 'Pannier' tanks. They made maintenance of fittings on the boiler top such as safety valves easier than saddle tanks, while leaving the inside motion relatively accessible compared with conventional side tanks – the decision to use them was practical rather than aesthetic.

By 1897 the specification for 0-6-0s had settled down to an acceptable format and therefore when, in 1901, George Jackson Churchward took over as Chief Mechanical Engineer he saw no reason to include a specification for this type in his programme for a new fleet of steam engines. This was a little surprising as even then existing designs were not very sophisticated and would have doubtless benefitted from the incorporation of some more modern parts and ideas. In fact only a handful of new 0-6-0Ts were built in this period and what developments there were came in the form of modifications to existing locomotives, including better boilers, new water tanks and improved cabs.

COLLETT STANDARDS

While Churchward took little interest in improving the humble 0-6-0T, the same was not true of his successor, Charles Collett, who came into office just before the grouping of 1923. At this time the GWR suddenly found itself the operator of a rag-bag collection of engines which it had acquired from its new constituent companies, many of which were in poor condition or unsuited for the work they were asked to perform. There was also the problem that many of the Western's own 0-6-0Ts, particularly the '1854' and '1813' classes, dated from the 1880s and were now worn out.

As a result design work commenced on what was intended to be the GWR's standard 0-6-0T for light duties with a specification based closely on the '2721' class of 1897, updated to include a boiler with Belpaire firebox, pannier tanks and an updated cab. A major improvement was that the new boiler worked at 200psi instead of 180psi offering a considerable power improvement over the older engines.

It took some time to finalise the design, which was considered to be so similar to existing engines that no prototype would need to be constructed for evaluation purposes. It was 1929 before the GWR was ready to begin a building programme. The initial order was for 100 locomotives from Swindon Works in the '57XX' number series. This was almost immediately followed up by an order for a further 200 with the impetus for this coming from the government, which was anxious to create work to assist in getting the country out of the Great Depression.

The majority of the second batch of locomotives was built by independent contractors with the North British Locomotive Company producing 100 of them, but others came from W.G. Bagnall, Kerr Stuart, the Yorkshire Engine Company and Armstrong Whitworth. This 'job creation' scheme came to an end in 1931 and after that the remainder of the engines were built by the GWR itself at Swindon.

WIDESPREAD VARIETY

new, while others had it added on delivery. However, some were in service without this, with most having it added at a later date.

The class was deployed all over the Great Western system and quickly ousted the older and outdated engines. They were mainly employed on light goods work, empty stock and short-distance commuter work. Many found their way onto branch lines but the class was never fitted for autotrain work and so could never be seen at the head of a push-pull train. The '6700s', having no train brakes, were used in South Wales where they worked in the docks and marshalling yards, mainly on coal traffic. They were also used on main line duties on occasions, and had a surprising turn of speed.

Construction continued more or less on a continuous basis with various modifications as the batches were built, although it is worth noting that the numbering system used meant that newer engines were not necessarily numbered in a higher batch than older ones. An amended cab design was used from 1933, with the biggest change being the use of square instead of round front and rear windows, but there was also a change to the rear of the crew access openings, where the roof met the backplate, and this was made more stylish on later engines.

The same year also saw a requirement for replacement engines suitable for use on the Metropolitan Line in London, on which the GWR worked a considerable amount of meat traffic to Smithfield Market. However due to the numerous sections of tunnel involved, locomotives fitted with condensing equipment had to be used and this led to 9701-9710 being turned out with shorter tanks, a different and more enclosed cab and modified train control equipment allowing them to be used on lines fitted with tripcock equipment. The prototype of this batch was reconstructed from Beyer Peacock-built 8700, which was numbered 9700, with a replacement 8700 being turned out by Swindon the following year incorporating the original locomotive's cab!

A LONG BUILD

When the railways were nationalised in 1948 Swindon Works was still turning out '57XXs', so from November that year new engines were equipped with British Railways style smokebox number plates. The final locomotive to this design, 6779, was delivered in December 1950, bringing to an end continuous construction which had lasted for 21 years. With a total of 863 built, they were amongst the most numerous steam locomotives in the country, with few coming anywhere close in terms of numbers built.

British Railways brought about a change in livery with green being replaced by black as the standard colour, although there were exceptions to this rule in the early years, with some being turned out in passenger style green livery. Nationalisation also saw some interesting transfers. The Southern Region used the class at Folkestone Harbour, at Weymouth and even for working empty stock between Waterloo and Clapham Junction while the London Midland Region used them in the Wrexham area following changes to regional boundaries. However, the arrival of diesel shunters, the closure of some lines and the decline in goods work meant that work for the class declined during the 1950s, with the result that withdrawals commenced in 1956, reaching a peak in 1962 when 170 examples were stood down. The last 27 bowed out in 1966 bringing the curtain down on main line operation for the class. While many of these had had long working lives some from the last-built 6750-6779 series only lasted less than 10 years.

Although none were acquired for preservation directly from British Railways, 13 were sold on to London Transport, where they were used for engineering and ballast trains. Slight modifications to the cab and structure were required to make them fit the tunnels after which they settled down to a routine existence, painted in full London Transport livery, with some examples lasting until 1971. Five more engines passed

to the National Coal Board, where they were worked to death, while one more, 9642, was bought by Hayes scrapyard and used to shunt its internal system.

These sales enabled some of the class to survive long enough to attract enthusiasts. Two of the NCB examples, 7714 and 7754, were saved to run on the Severn Valley and the Llangollen Railway respectively, 3650 went to the Great Western Society from PD Fuels near Ammanford, 9642 was saved from its scrapyard home by the South Wales Pannier Group and six of the London Transport engines were also saved for preservation. More engines were saved from the Barry scrapyard so that today there

are still 16 of the class existing, with many in working condition. One of the former London Transport engines, 5775, achieved a great deal of fame when it appeared in the 1970 film *Railway Children* filmed at the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway, and it is displayed at the Yorkshire line in the special livery that it wore for that film.

Today the remaining '57XX' and '8750' 0-6-0PTs form one of the most numerous designs in preservation where they continue to be popular, rugged and economical engines. They remain a fine testament to the work of Collett and his team, even though they do fall outside the scope of the GWR's impressive standardisation plans.



British narrow gauge modelling is coming of age, with a growing choice of models becoming available. **BEN JONES** looks at Bachmann's first 'OO9' steam locomotive – depicting an unsung hero of the First World War.

HE FIRST WORLD WAR is widely regarded as the first mechanised war, where the industrial might of nations was mobilised to produce fighting machines, ammunition and weapons on a massive scale.

Extensive use of light railways to support the military, providing lines of communication between rear bases and battlefields, started after the American Civil War, but the narrow gauge light railway really came into its own in the 1914-1918 conflict. The opposing sides faced each other for many months, fighting from extensive networks of trenches. The German and French armies anticipated this and introduced portable 600mm gauge railways to support their front lines.

From 1915 onwards, the British War Department Light Railways (WDLR) followed suit with a highly standardised system of field railways, using 4-6-0T steam locomotives for the main lines of communication and 20hp petrol tractors in various forms for movements at the front. Standard bogie wagons – opens and vans – were built in large quantities to carry everything from munitions to food and, in the opposite direction, casualties of the fighting.

The most numerous WDLR steam locomotive was the Baldwin 10-12-D 4-6-0T, 495 of which were built in the USA in just seven months between October 1916 and April 1917. They were simple, robust, quick and cheap to build and easy to maintain in difficult conditions. Although most were deployed in northeastern France and Belgium in 1916-1918, some found their way to the Middle East for use in Sinai and Palestine during 1917.

After November 1918, many of the Baldwins went on to work in France, Britain and India. A small number were brought back to the UK by the War Department and sold to minor railways in England and Wales.

The Welsh Highland Railway and Glyn Valley Tramway took one each, two went to Colonel Stephens' Snailbeach District Railways in Shropshire in 1923 and four more were acquired to work the newly-built Ashover Light Railway in Derbyshire from 1924.

A Next18 decoder socket is provided in the front portion of the locomotive.



THE MODEL

For its first foray into 4mm scale narrow gauge, the 10-12-D makes good sense for Bachmann. Although their origins were military, the locomotives also saw passenger, goods and industrial use in Britain and elsewhere with the final example working at Ashover until 1950. Three versions are available in the first batch; reviewed here is weathered black WDLR 778, based on the preserved example at the Leighton Buzzard Railway, and the other models are Ashover black *Bridget* and Glyn Valley Tramway No. 4 in lined black.

All feature subtle differences, including enclosed or open cabs and three designs of chimney. 778 has the original style open cab and tall, slender chimney with finely detailed



cover flap. Unlike the other two models it also features working LED headlamps, prominently mounted on the smokebox and bunker. These work well, although don't illuminate immediately when starting at low voltages.

A coreless motor provides smooth and consistent performance. All the samples we've seen have been superb runners, happily handling five or six bogie wagons on layouts with tight curves and short radius points. Rather than having a conventional front bogie, the wheel arrangement is more like a 2-2-6-0T, with the leading axle pivoted and its neighbour fixed ahead of the three driving axles. Simple hook style couplings are mounted in NEM sockets, allowing them to be removed or exchanged quickly and easily.

Digital Command Control (DCC) users will find conversion simple too thanks to the Next18 interface at the front end of the chassis. Remarkably for a locomotive of such small stature, the Baldwin has a factory-fitted speaker as standard and conversion to DCC sound operation only requires the installation of a suitable decoder - though the space available is restrictive at 20mm x 10mm.

OVERALL

Physically, the model is a really impressive recreation of the prototype, capturing its austere American outline very effectively. The overall shape and detail is enhanced by lots of separately-fitted external pipework, neatly moulded rivet heads and exquisitely modelled valve gear/motion. On

this open-cab version, the impressive footplate and boiler backhead detail is also on display, but it really needs a crew to complete the look.

Decoration and printing is simple, but perfectly executed. Weathering is subtly applied, with a pleasing ash-grey finish and gloss representation of water overspill from the tank fillers. A set of beautifully etched numberplates and Baldwin worksplates is also supplied to finish off the model.

Despite the wartime origins of the prototype, this is a really attractive little locomotive that will doubtless persuade many people to dip a toe in the world of 'OO9' narrow gauge modelling. 778 and its sisters offer almost endless potential for interesting and compact layouts and we look forward to seeing lots of them on the exhibition circuit over the coming years. (BJ)

Gloss finish for GBRf Evel



HE ARRIVAL of the last built Class 66 for GB Railfreight (GBRf) was marked by the unveiling of 66779 in BR lined green and its naming as Evening Star. The locomotive was named at the National Railway Museum on May 10 2016 and it is

fitting that this gloss finished limited edition has been commissioned by Locomotion Models.

Outwardly it is a standard Bachmann Class 66 model, correctly finished to represent 66779, and it comes with a standard accessory pack to detail the bufferbeams together

with etched metal Evening Star nameplates and plagues as well as brass bells to fully model the locomotive as it is in service.

The gloss finish to the paintwork makes this model stand out from the crowd while the actual livery itself is superbly

dual function. When stationary it sounds a guard's whistle while when the 'A4' is moving it offers flange squeal. F12 is similarly multitalented – when in shunting mode (F17) it opens and closes the cab door, while in train mode (F17 off) it plays coach door closing sounds which also vary with how long F12 is left switched on. Also included are coal tower (F15) and water tower (F16) sound effects, so you can even simulate your locomotive being replenished at the depot.

And there is more – Locoman has also built in different driver experience levels including normal and expert. These can be switched between simply and adjust the braking time and acceleration characteristics for more realism.

All in all, the new Gresley 'A4' sound project from Locoman Sounds is a thoroughly enthralling locomotive decoder package which brings with it tremendous operational value. This is the kind of sound project we like and we can see it being very well received by modellers looking to equip Hornby or Bachmann 'A4s' with a high value sound project. Nothing short of excellent and available for ESU and Zimo decoders. (MW)

DAPOL GLASS

The newest mainline diesels in Britain are proving popular with enthusiasts – but will Dapol's 2mm scale model?

MARK CHIVERS runs the rule over this latest release.



APOL'S eagerly awaited 'N' gauge Class 68 Bo-Bo diesel touched down in the Hornby Magazine office in March, with the arrival of 68001 Evolution in Direct Rail Services (DRS) 'Compass' livery. Intended for mixed traffic use, 34 locomotives have been built for DRS at Vossloh Rail

Vehicles/Stadler Rail's Spanish manufacturing facility in Valencia with the last examples arriving in the UK during July 2017.
Weighing in at 85tonnes, each features a Caterpillar C175-16 prime mover delivering a power out of 3,800hp. Top speed is 100mph.

power output of 3,800hp. Iop speed is 100mph As well as freight duties, they are diagrammed for regular passenger use with Abellio ScotRail on Fife Circle commuter services and with Chiltern Railways on push-pull duties between London Marylebone and Oxford/Banbury/ Birmingham Moor Street and Kidderminster.

TransPennine Express passenger services with new Mk 5a coaching stock are due to start later this year. As a result, some class members have been modified for their push-pull passenger roles including 68008-68015 for Chiltern operations and 68019-68034 for TransPennine Express.

More on the story of the Class 68s can be found

in HM118 in Reality Check alongside our review of Dapol's 'OO' gauge version of the locomotive.

THE MODEL

Straight from the box, Dapol's new'N' gauge model exudes quality, capturing the curves and sleek elegant lines of the prototype. Detailing is well crafted with finely moulded bodyside and roof fan grilles, roof pods and exhaust silencer together with plenty of separately fitted components including exquisite windscreen wipers, cab door and cab front handrails, jumper sockets, bogie frame steps, bufferbeam detailing, distinctive buffers and more.

Closer inspection reveals two forms of prepainted bufferbeam pipework, with a full set of pipes at one end and shortened versions at the other to ensure the pipes don't foul the coupling mechanism. In addition, the coupling hook at the front features a moulded interpretation of the coupling, while the bufferbeam at the rear has a plain hook. Extra pipework and coupling hooks are also included separately if you wish to change one end.

Application of the complicated DRS blue and turquoise 'Compass' colour scheme is impressive,



and stands up well under a magnifying glass too, with neatly printed *Evolution* nameplates, Vossloh branding (even on the bogie frames), DRS lettering, underframe component and bufferbeam stickers, Overhead Line Electrification (OLE) warning flashes, data panels, cab end door numbers and, of course, the compass logo itself. As with the most recent releases of its 'OO' gauge counterpart, the DRS livery elements match the prototype well, while small yellow warning panels are neatly applied to

new 'N' gauge Class 68 is also available in ScotRail's blue Saltire colour scheme and Chiltern Railways' grey and silver.

Detailing is equally impressive underneath, with bogie frames, underframe tanks and equipment boxes all nicely captured, together to each of the RP25 metal wheels.

PERFORMANCE

On test, our review sample ran very well, operating smoothly and quietly thanks to Dapol's new generation five-pole motor, twin flywheels and cardan shafts connected to each bogie tower for all-wheel drive, while electrical continuity is aided through brass pick-up wipers to all wheels.

Access to the model's die-cast metal chassis is simply a case of unclipping the bodyshell from its locating lugs on each side. The body will then slide off to reveal the model's internal circuitry, which includes five separate switches for altering lighting characteristics, a Next18 digital decoder interface and a 15.5mm x 11.25mm pre-cut rectangular speaker space, to aid digital sound installations, suitable for a cube style example. A foam

pad is also included here to help fix it in place. Each of the five lighting switches enables you to select cab illumination and directional lighting options in analogue and digital modes with two, four

and six function digital options

also selectable, which offers further independent lighting control for prototypical push-pull operation. A comprehensive 24-page colour booklet is included with further instructions, diagrams, explanation of switch settings and a handy spare parts list with exploded diagrams.

Given that a typical load for the prototype may include six Mk 3 carriages plus a Driving Van Trailer or 20 IKA Megafret intermodal flat wagons and containers, the model acquitted itself well, proving sure-footed over the gradients on Hornby Magazine's 'N' gauge test layout, hauling 23 Mk 1 carriages with ease on the level as well as on the 1-in-68 and 1-in-30 inclines with capacity for more.

OVERALL

Demonstrating amply what can be achieved in the scale, the level of detail, finesse and onboard circuitry within Dapol's Class 68 raises the bar yet again for 'N' gauge. As a true mixed-traffic locomotive that is likely to be around for many years, this model is a musthave for modellers of the contemporary scene and is sure to prove extremely popular. (MC)

ROTOCAB IS A WIRELESS CONTROL system pitched, initially, at 'OO' gauge locomotives. Its biggest selling point is that locomotives will carry their own power supply, so there is no need for complex wiring underneath a layout to make it operate.

Battery operation of locomotives means no track power supply which is great news for garden layout builders where providing a consistent source of electricity can be a tricky prospect. For indoor model railways, Protocab has stiff competition from mainstream digital and analogue control systems which, in the case of Digital Command Control particularly, offer greater functionality than what is currently available from Protocab.

For this review we are working with Acc+Ess Protocab's 0001L Starter Pack which contains all the components you need to get started. This consists of a Protocab handset, mains socket, Locomotive Control Unit (LCU), large battery, charging socket for the locomotive, connecting leads and full instructions.

STARTING OUT

The Protocab handset can control up to nine locomotives, all of which can be independently communicated with via the handset. This recognises when locomotives are in range including a rotary control to adjust the speed of the model, either forwards or reverse. The characteristics of individual locomotives can also be managed by the handset which is wireless too and capable of several weeks of layout operation with regular half hour charges after a full charge according to the manufacturer. A computer based management programme is also available which can change the allocation of LCUs between positions and handsets.

The main job involved in getting Protocab up and running is installation of the LCU, battery and their associated connections in a locomotive.

Once this is done, the

Protocab handset instantly recognises the LCU and can take control of the locomotive – and without the need to power the rails.

Fitting the LCU and its battery into a ready-torun locomotive will take care and planning, in
similar vein to installing a sound decoder and
speaker for Digital Command Control operation.
The battery does require a significant amount
of space and much is left to the modeller on a
locomotive-by-locomotive basis to find room
for the equipment. Protocab has stated that
it is developing smaller LCUs and batteries for
future release, as well as LCUs suited to larger
'O' gauge locomotives which the 0502 series
cannot currently be used for. The 0502 can
only be used for locomotives with a
maximum stall current of 500mA.

GB Raufreigh

For this review we equipped a Hornby Class 66 with a 0502 25mm x 18mm x 4mm LCU, a large 42mm x 30mm x 7mm battery, a Locoswitch and a charging socket. This set of electronic components is neatly designed with all the connections between parts being made with clip together connectors – no soldering is required for this stage.

soldering is required for this stage.
The only soldering required is connection of the two black wires to the motor terminals

Protocab 0502 LCU takes care of communication between the handset and motor.

ASPINALLAPPEAL



ANK ENGINES can be tricky for sound installation. Limited space for decoders and speakers and the need to hide additional equipment are a great challenge which sometimes requires a little lateral thinking to come up with a workable solution.

For this step by step guide we are working on a Bachmann Aspinall '1008' 2-4-2T in 'OO' gauge. The model first appeared in winter 2013 (HM79) and a number of versions have been released covering Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway (LYR), London Midland and Scottish Railway (LMS) and British Railways (BR) colour schemes. Our candidate is BR lined black liveried 50725, renumbered from 50705, with early crests on the side tanks.

To show the full potential of the locomotive, we are illustrating how a standard motor control decoder can be installed as well as going to the lengths of installing sound.

Adding a motor control chip to convert this

locomotive for Digital Command Control (DCC) operation is straightforward – the challenge comes when introducing sound due to the limited internal spaces in the 2-4-2T.

Our choice of decoder for the sound installation is a Zimo MX648R which we have hardwired into the locomotive in place of the original socket. A Zimo 15mm x 11mm x 12mm cube speaker emits the sound while the sound file selected is Digitrains latest for the LMS Fowler 'Jinty' 0-6-0T. This new sound file includes manual reverser settings for a more direct driving experience, but as you might expect, using it for the 2-4-2T means a couple of small adjustments.

To prepare this locomotive for service, we gave it a four-digit address – 0725 – using the last four digits of its number and then adjusted the exhaust beat in CV267 to 125 to match the wheel revolutions. We also adjusted the coasting time by setting CV285 to 255 – this extends the period which the coasting sounds play to

their maximum on decreasing of the speed by one speed step. This adds a great deal of operational value to the model, as it can coast for greater distances (25.5seconds to be exact) without a need to keep reducing the speed.

The process of installing the MX648R decoder takes care and a steady hand and it should be noted that the work we have carried out will void warranties on both the locomotive and decoder. We recommend you read the full guide before committing to any modifications to understand what is involved. If you haven't already, you will need a fine nib for your soldering iron to allow access to the tiny solder pads on the MX648 decoder board.

The end result though is a superb sounding tank engine which is perfect at the head of a short passenger train or on duty as station pilot.

To begin we need to dismantle the locomotive for access to the chassis and decoder socket. Start by removing both couplings and their respective pockets using tweezers to allow access to the screw heads





The first screw we need to remove is located at the centre rear of the chassis. Remove it and keep it safe for reassembly.




At the front are two screws to separate the body and chassis – one above the coupling mount right at the front and the other behind the leading pony truck

DIGITAL CONTROL







Next cut the wires from the back of the decoder socket – make the cut as close as possible to the PCB so that you have

Bachmann's 2-4-2T has correctly colour coded wires for DCC motor (orange and grey) and track (red and black) feeds.



The decoder needs to have its cover cut open so that we can make the most space efficient connections between the locomotive and the chip. Carefully score down one edge of the cover with a craft knife and peel it open. Keep it safe for reuse later in this guide.



Here we have removed all the surplus wires for this installation (brown, blue, white, green and yellow) leaving stubs of the orange, grey, black and red wires as a note of their location. The purple speaker wires are left in full.

the reverse process of its removal, to allow connection of the speaker to complete the installation.

The driver has been glued in place as a marker for the position of the speaker.



Working carefully to ensure you connect the right wires to the right positions on the decoder board, the original decoder wires are replaced with those from the locomotive. To solder at such a small size use a 1mm nib on a soldering iron and a quick action to minimise the chances of damaging the decoder board. Check all your connections carefully and if there is any chance of a short circuit re-solder the joint.



Solder the bare ends of the speaker wires to the speaker and add black insulation tape over the top to disguise their appearance. We also painted the purple wires black at the top and glued the fireman in place to further disguise the speaker. Superglue has been used to fix the crew and speaker in place.

Finally, the speaker wires are fed back into the bunker and the cab assembly is clipped back into place at the front and secured at the rear with its original screws. As you can see, the speaker is difficult to see inside the cab with the addition of a crew. The 2-4-2T is now ready to enter service.

Ketton Cement



The idea of modelling modern cement operations took a giant leap forward for MARTIN STEWART when he received a set of inspirational photographs. Here he explains this 2mm scale layout's development from start to finish.





ETTON CEMENT is very loosely based on the real Ketton Cement Works in Rutland. The idea came about by chance after I purchased a boxload of the then-new Graham Farish Metalair PCA wagons – and as soon as I got them I knew I wanted to build a layout based around modern cement operations.

Soon after this, I was clearing through some boxes of modelling magazines when I found an old issue of the Diesel and Electric Modellers United (DEMU) Compendium which briefly discussed an idea for a small 4mm scale layout based on the trackplan at Ketton Cement Works. Upon further research using satellite images and internet searches I drew several versions of the desired trackplan out on two 1,300mm x 340mm baseboards I already had from an abandoned project until I ended up with something I was happy with.

After publishing my progress so far on the DEMU forum, a fellow member contacted me to say he had written the original article which inspired me and sent me around 100 high resolution photographs he had taken in and around Ketton Cement Works during an open day. These were just what I needed to be able to model some of the real buildings on the site and I can't thank him enough for the help he's provided the project.


Real life operations at Ketton would make for a fairly uninteresting model railway (in my opinion) so I thought I would use some modeller's licence to change this. The real location is worked by small shunters with short wheelbase wagons due to the tight curves on site, but I decided to model this as a through freight line to allow longer trains hauled by main line diesels to increase operational interest. It would also allow me to run specials or engineering trains if I felt like it, further expanding its potential.

The basic train types represent full coal loads coming in delivering coal to fire the kilns with empties travelling in the opposite direction. There are empty and full Cargowaggons used to represent freight for the bagging plant off scene. The main attraction is the silo structure which is used to load powdered cement into tanker wagons. Each of these trains is made up of a few different types of cement wagon which makes for an interesting variation in stock movements.

SETTING THE SCENE

From the outset, I had the idea of framing the scenic area to make it more immersive to the viewer. I believe I have achieved this with the combination of several factors.

The first was to have a tall backscene with integrated lighting pelmet so that no outside light can enter from above. This also removes any distractions from behind the layout. The second was to build a contoured fascia painted a dark grey to draw the viewer's eye into the scene. The third was



to install an effective LED lighting system with diffuser to ensure an even light which represents mid-afternoon sunlight in late summer. Lastly, I have created a forced perspective in the shallow baseboard by constructing a cutting with trees which blends into the backscene. The purpose of this is to draw the viewer's eyes through the trees and down the embankment to view the approaching trains running under the bridge and, in turn, creating an effective scenic break. Viewers are also encouraged to look through the silo building to see what is happening behind. The whole layout sits at a height suitable for adults to look into the scene instead of 'down on' it.

WHY 2MM FINESCALE?


I've been a 2mm modeller for many years now after downsizing from 4mm scale. I always liked the idea of having longer trains in the same space as 4mm or being able to create a more realistic 'railway in a landscape' but always felt the scale was let down by off-the-



shelf track products. I was bitten by the 2mm finescale bug several years ago at a model railway exhibition where I could immediately see the visual and running differences when compared to proprietary 'N' gauge track so I quickly joined the 2mm Scale Association and haven't looked back since. I found a lot of enjoyment (and frustration) from building my own trackwork to 9.42mm gauge and using the correct British sleeper spacing. There are a few different disciplines within the 2mm Scale Association, but I have chosen to utilise 1:148 scale models, rewheeled to run on finescale track. I feel the extra effort to build the track and rewheel rolling stock is worth it and you are rewarded by smoother running and a finer appearance.

TRACK AND POINTS


All the straight track on Ketton Cement is the excellent Easitrac sleeper bases with code 40 flat bottom rail available from the 2mm Scale Association. The turnouts are a completely different story. The




Easitrac range contains some excellent components for modelling bullhead trackwork but I wanted to go a step further and build everything in flat bottom rail.

This idea started well before the layout was conceived and a few failed attempts with copper-clad sleepers later led me down the path of designing custom jigs in which to construct a number of different turnouts. Basically, these jigs work the same as the fantastic FastTracks products but have been designed for 9.42mm gauge and British sleeper spacing. A single aluminium jig will allow me to build either a left or right-hand turnout from scratch in around an hour. The jig has slots machined to accept all the rail and pockets machined to accept copper-clad sleepers at key intervals. I use the FastTracks PointForm tools to file parts to create the crossing Vee and switch rails. I also use the StockAid tool to file away the foot of the flat bottom rail where the switch rail meets the stock rail. Once all the rails have been filed and soldered to the key copper-clad sleepers, the whole 'skeleton' of a turnout is pulled from the jig and is fully operational, if a little flexible. It's at this point I've used my original drawings to create a negative of the jigs to create a laser cut fret of sleepers to fill in the gaps. This has been cut from 0.8mm plywood to match the thickness of Easitrac sleepers and is glued to the underside of the rails using a rubber-based contact adhesive. Once this has been left to cure, I simply snap off the plywood sprue and file the tabs off the end of the sleepers. The turnout is now ready to paint and lay on the layout.

The advantage of this system is that you can get consistent results every time and all the turnouts required for a layout can be constructed on the workbench well in advance and laid later. The lack of plastic rail chairs wasn't too important to me as any moulded plastic chair would be overscale anyway and look out of place. Once the track has been laid, painted, ballasted and weathered, I think the result is far superior to commercially available 'N' gauge track and rolling stock actually runs more smoothly. >>>







LAYOUT CONTROL

Ketton Cement has been split into two different control types. All the rolling stock is controlled using Lenz Digital Command Control (DCC) as I feel it was much easier to wire the layout this way and it is what I'm used to. The turnouts are operated using traditional DC but I have gone down the route of using small servos to move the turnouts. A 12V bus runs around the layout where each of the servos has a small control board which feeds off this. These boards are constructed from a MERG PocketMoney Kit which allows a highly controllable slow action motion to switch turnouts. This is all wired back to a custom control panel where turnout direction is indicated by the direction of the toggle switches and blue LEDs. The frog polarity for each of the turnouts is automatically controlled by the excellent Gaugemaster Autofrogs which massively cuts down on the wiring.

BUILDINGS

All the buildings on the layout are based on photographs of real structures within Ketton Cement Works but I've used some flexibility when it comes to location. The buildings along the backscene have been built with a 3mm plywood frame which was then clad in Evergreen sheets of appropriate type. The silos have been created with some cheap gutter downpipe bought from my local DIY store which have then had various bits of plasticard and Evergreen sheet glued on to create a representation of the real thing. The silo extensions have been created from Plastruct I section to create the structural frame and then clad with Evergreen sheet again. There are still many details to be added to these buildings along with a few smaller buildings in between to build up the industrial look of the place.


Ketton Cement has been a testing ground for me to try new scenic techniques and products. I've learned from multiple sources that the trick is to build up layers over time to create the desired effect. From the beginning, I wanted there to be some sort of scenic break to the right-hand side of the layout where spectators could look through the trees and down the cutting

to watch the tops of the trains pass by and into the cement plant. The backscene dictated the palette of colours I had to work with, so I set about using a selection of earth and green scatters to create a base coat then followed that up with a mixture of static grass colours. The overgrown areas have been achieved by then adding small sections of clump foliage and completely covering in a diluted PVA mixture before covering in a second layer of mixed static grass. The effect I aimed to create was a sort of late summertime where the trees are still green, but the grass has started to change colour and I've tried to blend everything into the backscene to create a sense of perspective. Lastly, I attempted to further blend the scenery together with an airbrush and a small palette of acrylic colours. The ballast and track were weathered first to set the tones then the grass areas were tackled.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

Ketton Cement is nowhere near what I would call finished as the structures all need some degree of finishing and there are still lots of details to add all over the layout. I have also built up a large collection of suitable rolling stock for what is a relatively small layout and all this still needs to be rewheeled, detailed, have new couplings fitted and be weathered. On top of all of that, I have been looking into the possibility of a new kit for Ketton's signature wagon, the CFMF PCA.

The layout has been exhibited at a few shows now and has so far been well received including two awards, so the plan is to introduce new items to the layout for every show it attends until I feel I can add no more. This layout has been a great learning experience and my first ever built to an exhibition standard, so it has given me the confidence to progress with research for my next long-term project while being able to experiment with new techniques. I may have built Ketton Cement in my spare time, but I couldn't have done it without the advice and ideas from my friends in DEMU and Scottish Modellers as well as their help and support at exhibitions.






ONSTRUCTION IS BIG business in the UK.
Many cities are seeing an unprecedented number of new buildings being built with some, such as Birmingham, having whole sections of their centres renewed. There is also massive investment in new transport systems, with schemes such as High Speed 2 and London's Crossrail involving construction projects on a scale not seen since Victorian times.

Projects of this nature swallow up vast quantities of raw materials, with one of the most important being cement, a material which is provided by an industry with an annual turnover of around £800m and employing around 2,500 people.

Cement is a binder that can be used to bond building materials such as bricks together and it can also be used alongside aggregates to form concrete, one of the most widely-used materials in construction today. It is made by heating a mixture of limestone or chalk with shale or clay to a very high temperature at which point it forms a calcium silicate which is then ground with gypsum into a fine powder. Forms of cement have existed for thousands of years and it is likely that the substance reached Britain with the Romans, who originally used ground pottery or volcanic ash rather than limestone or chalk as a base.

Improvements in the techniques used for manufacturing cement in the 18th century included the invention of 'Roman Cement' which contained clay materials and calcium carbonate. It was capable of setting in around 15 minutes, something that was of great value to early lighthouse, sewer and tunnel builders. In 1824 Joseph Aspdin invented Portland cement, so called because it had a similar colour to Portland stone when used as a render. His son William introduced »



further improvements which slashed the cost of the finished product, enabling a dramatic increase in building activity as the Industrial Revolution progressed.

Cement was ideal for railway transport. It was used in bulk, it was heavy and it had to be manufactured near to the sites where raw material was available, which were almost

never near the major centres of population. Production centres grew up in places with considerable limestone deposits, such as Derbyshire, and finished product was taken to

where it was needed, and such were the quantities involved that even from the start dedicated trains were often required.

BAGGED PRODUCE

In these early years, and indeed right through to the first quarter of the last century, cement was almost always dispatched from the manufacturers in bags. These were loaded manually into standard closed box vans and stacked until the van was about half full, at which point its maximum payload was reached.

Handling cement in this way was laborious and dirty work for inevitably one or more bags would split open, allowing dust to settle in the wagon and around the loading area. However, this method did have its advantages in that it enabled small shipments to be dispatched to distribution points that were often set up in a corner of a goods yard and which often comprised of no more than a couple of grounded goods van bodies or a small warehouse from which cement was sold on to local builders and contractors.

Production of cement rose dramatically with the more widespread use of concrete after the First World War and the 1920s saw a number of very large plants constructed, some of which are still in operation today. A typical example of this is the Hope Cement Works in Derbyshire which was established in 1929 by G&T Earle, and which was deliberately sited near to the former Midland Railway Sheffield to Manchester line. A two-mile private branch was built to connect the works with the main line and so large did the

a year, and it still has its branch line with its own locomotives, including a hired-in former BR Class 20.

Another centre for cement production was North Kent, which had suitable natural deposits of chalk and clay. Several companies had set up in business around Cliffe and there the Alpha Cement Works was founded in 1910 as part of the Thames Portland Cement Company. When joined with the Francis works it had a considerable railway system and was a major producer until it ran out of raw materials around 1970.

AUTOMATED HANDLING

During the early 1950s it was realised that manual methods of handling were inefficient and wasteful and consequently efforts were made to modernise the way that cement was handled. This led to the introduction of the L Type container, which was a cube-shaped object that could be loaded at the top and unloaded at the bottom and carried four tons of cement. Carried three to a Conflat wagon, these were immortalised by Triang's popular model in the 1960s.


Successful as the L Type container was, it did not provide a complete answer to the problem of moving larger quantities of cement so in 1954 British Railways Shildon

wagon works produced a 20ton capacity wagon known as the Pressure Discharge Bulk Powder Wagon, or 'Presflo' for short. These distinctive vehicles were loaded by gravity from above but could be pressurised so that they could be emptied through flexible pipes attached at the side. Vacuum brakes and roller bearings were provided to enable high-speed running. A total of 1,891 'Presflos' were built between 1955 and 1963, with use of the type later spreading to salt and other powder traffic. Many wagons were finished in bright company liveries and consequently this design captured the imagination of modellers with many of us building one from the Airfix, now Dapol, kit while those with a bit more money bought one ready made from Hornby Dublo.

In 1958 there was a change to wagon design as it had been found that cement was reluctant to slide out of the shallow-sided 'Presflo' and product often became stuck in the corners of the tanks. As a result the 'Prestwin' was designed, which had two cylindrical silos which were circular and a baseplate through which air could be pumped to agitate the cargo when unloading. Again this wagon attracted the attention of the model manufacturers with Airfix producing a kit and Hornby Dublo the completed model.

The next step forward came from Associated Portland cement, which was seeking a lightweight high-speed fourwheel wagon to carry its Blue Circle cement products from Cliffe in Kent to

Uddingston near Glasgow. These new tankers, known as 'Cemflo' appeared to the casual observer to be large tankers but were actually quite revolutionary, being largely made of aluminium alloy, and having a 12ft wheelbase to allow higher speeds. Their use attracted a lot of attention from enthusiasts, mainly because trains of these wagons were worked up the East Coast Main Line as far as York by Class 33s but also because it was a train of such 'Cemflos' that derailed near York in July 1967 causing the early demise of Class 50 prototype DP2, which ran into the wreckage.

Similar wagons were produced by a number of other manufacturers but all shared the same problem and that was that they were difficult to discharge. In an effort to combat this, 'depressed centre' style wagons, also named 'Presflos' came to be more common. In this style there are two tank sections, one for each half of the wagon, which are welded together so the centre is lower than the edges, using gravity to assist with unloading by a centrally placed valve. By this time air brakes had become standard. Many of these wagons also appeared in colourful company liveries.

MODERN TRANSPORT

As with many other forms of traffic cement has moved into bogie wagons but the basic concept has remained the same, with depressed centre designs provided with aeration and pressure discharge. Amongst the latest to be delivered are a fleet of 48

bogie vehicles built by Feldbinder for Hope Construction which have a capacity of 80tons - more than twice that of the fourwheelers they are replacing. Each train of these wagons has a payload of 1,850tons, an increase of 500tons over the old type.

While wagon development continued unabated throughout the last half of the 20th century concerns were being raised by railway management about the profitability of some of the traffic carried. The remote location of some of the manufacturing plants led to high operating costs; for instance, the Eastgate Cement works in Weardale, County Durham, which dispatched two trains a day, was served by an 18-mile long branch

line which had no other traffic. When, in the run-up to privatisation, the Government decreed that all freight traffic had to make a minimum return of 8% on capital invested, much of the cement traffic failed to meet this target, with the result that much of it was merely handed over to road transport, even though it was actually making a profit!

However, despite the loss of smaller flows over the last 20 years, cement remains today a significant source of income for the freight companies, and is set to be so for many years in the future. With everything from major production works, colourful company trains and tiny distribution centres, cement traffic offers endless modelling possibilities.



STAFF PROJECTS

The 'OO' gauge test track design is going from strength to strength. A month on from the last update, **MIKE WILD** brings you the latest from behind the scenes in the *Hornby Magazine* workshop.

T'S BEEN AN INTENSIVE MONTH in the Homby Magazine workshop. Not only have we taken Twelve Trees Junction out to the Basingstoke Model Railway Exhibition, but we have also been developing the test tracks and making progress with the extensive job list following relocation of the layouts at the beginning of the year.

Top of the priority list is Topley Dale which we had to have up and running by the beginning of March for use in video footage. Followers of our

online content will have spotted videos of the 'OO' layout on the *Hornby Magazine* website giving a brief view of what we have been doing. But there is much more to report than what you first see.

For starters we now have layouts in three scales fully assembled and working again. The 'N' gauge layout, Barrenthorpe, is now back in one piece after a period in store and ready to serve its purpose. The 'O' gauge layout has seen a number of items resolved with all but one loop now powered, a couple of yards of track replaced and

a decision made on which way round the scenery should face on the junction boards. We've also installed a full set of independent lighting for the 'O'gauge layout so it doesn't rely on the room lights in its position underneath the 'OO'gauge and installed the first of two new backdrops.

We plan to go into more detail on the 'O' gauge section in a future issue and what we have been doing in that scale, but for now we will concentrate on development of the 'OO' top deck.

Topley Dale is up and running again and while we have no plans for overhead electrification, discovery of a pair of Class 76s saw one pressed into service on a coal train. The junction to the left will lead around to the second junction at the other end of the storage yard providing a bypass route.

MIKEWILD

The 'O' gauge lower level has kept Mike busy as well this month with cleaning and wiring to bring it back into full service as well as installing independent lighting.

Mark has been working his enlarged fleet of 'OO' gauge ScotRail Class 47/7s following arrival of 47708 and 47712 including fitting detailing parts.



Construction of the new storage yard started with the junction pointwork. The original curves were cut back to have a pair of large radius left points installed and a diamond crossing. Here we are setting out the position of the pointwork.



Installing the first of the new storage yard lines is a simple case of joining yard lengths of track together. We drilled 8mm holes for point motors under each point during installation for the future addition of motors.



With such long lengths of straight track we used a metre long straight edge to assist in lining each track up. Two more loops are to be added to the outer circuit at this point and four for the inner.

TRACK LAYING

First on the job list was painting of all the baseboard surfaces in grey to seal the wood. The colour choice isn't particularly important, but for some reason we find that grey looks smart and retains its quality appearance over a longer period.

The most obvious, and necessary, addition this month is track. Continuing the theme of the original layout, Peco code 75 flexible track and points have been used to build the new formation which involves 24 points, two diamond crossings and around 30 yards of track so far.

The starting point, as always for our designs, is the most complex junctions. Get those right and the rest of the railway will start to flow and fall into place. The initial phase of work was centred around the access to the storage yard next to the original tunnel. This began with removal of the last 400mm of the curves exiting the tunnel from Topley Dale station to create a straight joint to connect to a pair of large radius left-hand points. In turn these were joined to a diamond crossing to introduce a secondary route to the layout – a new part of the plan, see track diagram overleaf – which will further increase the range of pointwork that models have to negotiate during their tests.

Together these three pieces of track create the

starting point for the storage yard access at the rear of the layout. This will consist of 10 tracks, five in each direction, and with six laid so far we are pleased to say that all are capable of holding

an eight-coach train on the outer circuit. To assist in this, one end uses a ladder of medium radius points while the other uses large radius curved right-hand points to make the most of the space available. It has worked well and with 1/16in cork laid underneath the storage

yard is smooth and quiet running.

As this is a permanent layout, we are able to hold off on some elements of the layout build in pursuit of getting trains running. This really relates to baseboard joints where, for now, we have simply cut the sleepers away where replacement copper-clad board will be inserted so that we can come back to this part of the build at a later date.

Moving to the front of the layout, we concentrated on the outer circuit first. With the


new trackplan the outer has become the simplest to lay. It will now be the circuit which is capable of being controlled by analogue or digital, rather than the inner as we had first proposed.

The scenic section required copper-clad sleepers to be installed at the baseboard joint to allow wiring and track weathering to take place. These are DCC Concepts' pre-etched sleepers which have solder pads on them providing a quick and simple means of installing at baseboard joints instead of copper clad board (Cat No. ESP-TRACK1.0).

Progress started by positioning the three-arch bridge on the scenic section to gauge where the line would run. The bridge has been reclaimed from the original corner board of Topley Dale and will still accommodate four tracks running through it. The main lines will take the centre full opening

with the goods loops using the outer arches.

The outer main line and goods loop were laid together which involved taking up part of the old formation to straighten it out next to the goods yard and then introducing the second double junction to create the exit route from that at the start of the storage yard. The main line was soon completed and then in an evening we started on the wiring by installing the first of two power buses – one for the outer circuit >>>





On the scenic section the original three-arch bridge was the starting point for track positioning. A second double junction was positioned to one side of it to create the bypass round the storage yard.

and one for the point motors and accessories. A third followed for the inner circuit once the track work had been completed for this section.

Throughout the building process we were checking clearances and making adjustments to the track to ensure that trains would run comfortably through the bridge and past one another on the curves. One small adjustment may still be needed on the goods loop to accommodate the signal when it is installed, but that will be simple enough to do.

At the end of March we had completed the inner circuit – although four of the storage yard loops remained to be done. Being purely digital, it is being wired up to be live throughout which means a few extra connections in the storage yard to ensure there are no dead spots. In addition, we installed a pair of Tam Valley Depot Dual Frog Juicers to power the

frogs on the diamond crossings. These are solid state electronics which will give us the reliability required for a layout which is in almost daily use – and sometimes with trains running for up to eight hours at a time.

The third power bus accommodates all of these extras and with the installation of the new wiring we have also begun the complex process of rewiring the original boards to bring them up to our current standard. That will take some time, but ultimately we will have much neater under board electrics as well as an even more reliable layout.

NEXT STEPS

The plan to reach the stage of scenery during March hasn't quite been achieved, but we have made great progress on Topley Dale. The track plan has been finalised

(apart from another potential addition, which I will come to later) and with trains running it is already proving its worth.

On the project list are gradients, open frame scenery, full signalling, potential expansion of the goods yard and a refresh of the original scenery to bring the whole layout up to a higher standard. We'll be keeping you updated on progress in Staff Projects, but keep an eye on our online videos to see trains running through the new trackwork.
