FIRST J36' DEBUTS IN

ORNBY has received the first full decorated sample of its Reid 'J36' 0-6-0 for 'OO' gauge.
Delivered in BR black as 65311 Haig, the model is expected to be released in December 2018 priced at £139.99 (Cat No. R3622).

65311 was built in 1899 as 753 for the North British Railway and, after operation by the London North Eastern Railway between 1923 and 1947 as 9753, 5311 from 1946, it entered British Railways stock on January 1 1948 when it became 65311.

Allocations in BR ownership included St Margarets in Edinburgh (64A) and Polmont (64E) – the latter being its final shed. Withdrawal came in November 1963 and it was disposed of in June 1964.

Hornby's model of 65311 is supplied with an optional snowplough in the accessory pack as well as the usual bufferbeam details. It models the locomotive in early 1950s condition with early crests on the tender.

The specification includes an 8-pin DCC decoder socket in the tender, space for a speaker for digital sound, all wheel pick up and a five-pole motor in the boiler.

On release 65311 will be joined by 673 Maude in NBR lined black with Twin Track Sound (R3600TTS) priced at £164.99 and 722 in LNER lined black (R3621) priced at £139.99. Decorated samples for these two versions are expected to arrive with Hornby during September.

First Class 87s arrive in the shops

Hornby's eagerly anticipated model of the BR Class 87 AC overhead electric (see HM132 for our full preview to the Hornby Class 87) arrived in the shops at the end of August as Hornby Magazine closed for press.

Originally expected to arrive in May, manufacturing problems delayed the 87's arrival in the UK.

The first two to arrive are 87035 Robert Burns in BR blue (Cat No. R3580) and 87010 King Arthur in Intercity livery (R3582) priced

at £170.99 each. Both feature 8-pin DCC decoder sockets, directional lighting, day and night lighting and a powerful five-pole motor with twin flywheels.

In July 2019 87035 and 87010 will be joined by 87019 Sir Winston Churchill in Virgin Trains red and black colours (R3656) to complement the recently released Virgin Trains Mk 3 Driving Van Trailer (HM134).

Paddingto '800' sampl



FULL decorated sample including unique packaging for Hornby's model of Class 800 800010 Paddinaton Bear/Michael Bond (Cat No. R3691) has been received for inspection at Hornby HQ. The Class 800 will cost £399.99 and is expected to be released in October 2018.

The Class 800 train pack contains PDTRBFO 815010. MCO 814010, 813010, 812010 and PDTSO 811010. The train was named Paddington Bear/ Michael Bond at Paddington

station on January 10 2018 by the daughter of author Michael Bond and it includes illustrations by Peggy Fortnum, the original illustrator of the Paddington books, on the doors of 800010.

The Class 800 includes a five pole motor with twin flywheels, directional lighting, interior lighting, an 8-pin DCC decoder socket in each of the driving cars and full interior and exterior detailing. It is designed to operate on a minimum of second radius curves.

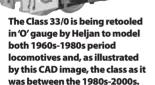

HREE new ready-to-run
'O' gauge projects were
revealed by Heljan at the
annual Gauge O Guild
exhibition in Telford on September 1.
The manufacturer has announced it
will be making a brand new version
of the Class 33, the popular Class
56 and the AEC/GWR diesel railcar.

The Class 33 is receiving updated and modified tooling to allow it to accurately model 1960-1980 and 1980-2000 period locomotives. This includes changes to the roof detail and the addition of high intensity lights.

In total 10 versions will be released priced at £549 each and expected to arrive in early 2019. Livery choices include plain BR green (Cat No. 3393), BR green with small yellow warning panels (3394), BR green

calls for twin motors, LED lighting, see through grilles, plus sprung buffers and couplings. Heljan also stated that it is being developed for easy Digital Command Control decoder and sound installation as well as having provision for a smoke generator to be fitted.

Prices are to be confirmed for the Class 56, but livery choices will include BR blue (Cat No. 5600), BR'Large Logo' blue (5601), Railfreight grey with large logos (5602), Railfreight'red stripe' grey (5603), Railfreight triple grey without branding (5604), Railfreight triple grey with coal sector markings (5605), Railfreight triple grey with construction sector markings (5606) and Loadhaul black and orange (5607).

Adding to Heljan's range of steam era Great Western Railway outline models is its new project to develop the GWR/AEC 'razor edge' railcar for 'O' gauge. It will model the GWR built vehicles No. 19-33 and is to feature interior and exterior detail, a

low profile mechanism, LED lighting, sprung buffers and couplings, simple DCC and sound installation options and interior lighting.

As with the Class 56, pricing is to be announced, but livery choices are confirmed as GWR chocolate and cream with white roof and monograms (Cat No. 1900), GWR chocolate and cream with grey roof and GWR coat of arms (1901), BR crimson and cream with a grey roof (1902), BR crimson and cream with white cab roofs (1903), BR green with speed whiskers and white cab roofs (1904) and BR green with speed whiskers and a grey roof (1904).

As well as announcing the 'O' gauge version of the GWR railcar, Heljan also confirmed that it was working on a 'OO' gauge model of the same vehicles. Liveries and specification are expected to match the 'O' gauge version, with full details and prices to be announced.

CLASS 03 ENGINEERING SAMPLE REVEALED

Heljan has revealed the first full engineering sample of its new 'O' gauge ready-to-run model of the Class 03 0-6-0DM shunter. It is due to be released in 2019 in BR green, with and without 'wasp stripes', BR blue and industrial yellow and blue schemes.

The Class 03 is being offered with and without locomotive numbers and with a choice of conical and flowerpot chimneys with 14 due for release in the first batch. 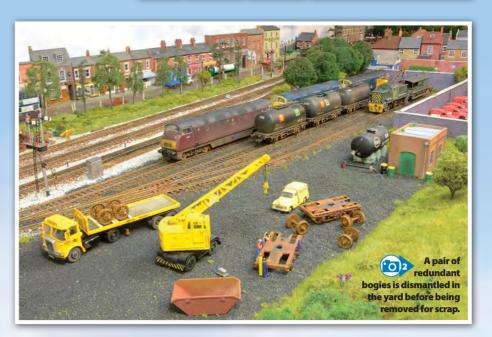

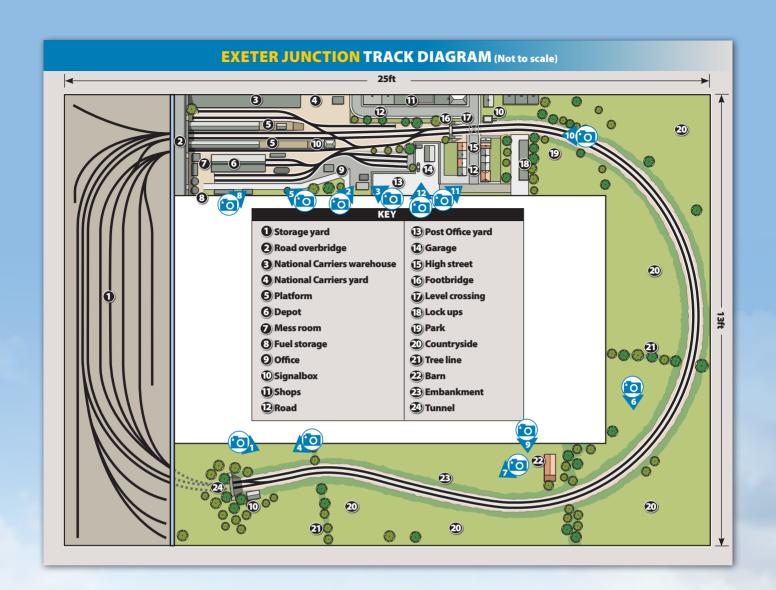


GOT MY FIRST TRAIN SET FROM my parents aged six, which started my interest. I started trainspotting from my aunt and uncle's house as the West Coast Main Line ran behind it. The route had just been electrified but we still had a steady stream of classes 25, 40, 47 and the 50s. Then aged 11, I started to travel all over the country with friends and eventually a railway club at school visiting many depots and works.

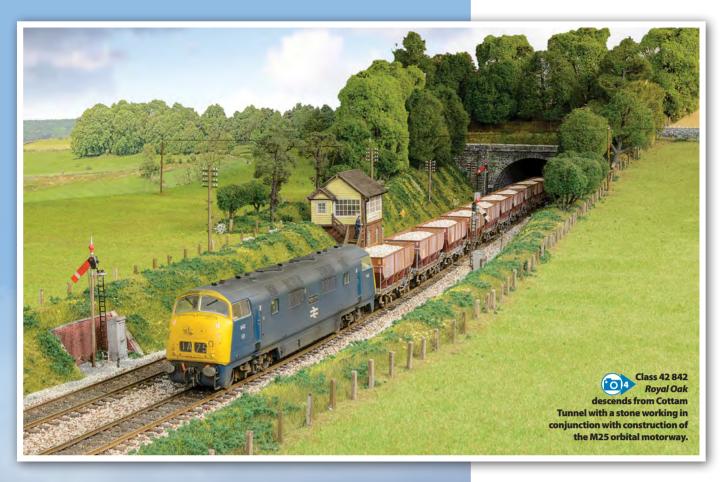
Saving our pocket money and travelling from the North West to the Western Region coincided with the last few years of the diesel-hydraulics. We spent many Saturdays on platforms at Paddington, Reading and Bristol and 'bunked' the depots at Old Oak Common and Bristol Bath Road. Days often finished with being chased out of the yard at Swindon Works and this inspired a short line of withdrawn Class 42 'Warships' on the layout next to the main line. They were such great happy times ">>>> **

and with all these memories this had to be the region I chose for my layout. We all have different reasons for modelling a certain area and time and this was mine.

I have only been modelling for about eight years, but being a train driver helped me to study the layout of the railway network in detail including cuttings, tunnels and track work - it's amazing how observant this hobby makes you, observing things you have never seen before even down to how things weather.

THE LAYOUT

I had many requirements for the layout and the planning stage took quite a while - a process that I have to admit I enjoyed. I decided early on that I wanted a large 'tail chaser' to let the engines get a good run. I am very lucky in having a decent sized loft giving me a 25ft x 13ft layout.

My main operational requirements were a station with a bay and with enough platforms to carry out locomotive changes from diesel-electrics to diesel-hydraulics and *vice versa* so the track layout and adjacent depot were designed with this in mind. It's actually quite therapeutic spending time doing this, and sound fitted locomotives add a great dimension to it.

Almost two-thirds of the layout is given over to just two tracks running mainly in open fields with a mixture of cuttings and embankments inspired partly by studying many railway books over the years featuring the beautiful Somerset and Devon countryside. It's very relaxing just watching the trains running through the open scenery and I have to say quite rewarding.

At the non-scenic end of the layout>>>

is a large hidden storage yard with loops and sidings on both sides of the running lines. This makes the operation far more flexible enabling the quick smooth changeover of trains.

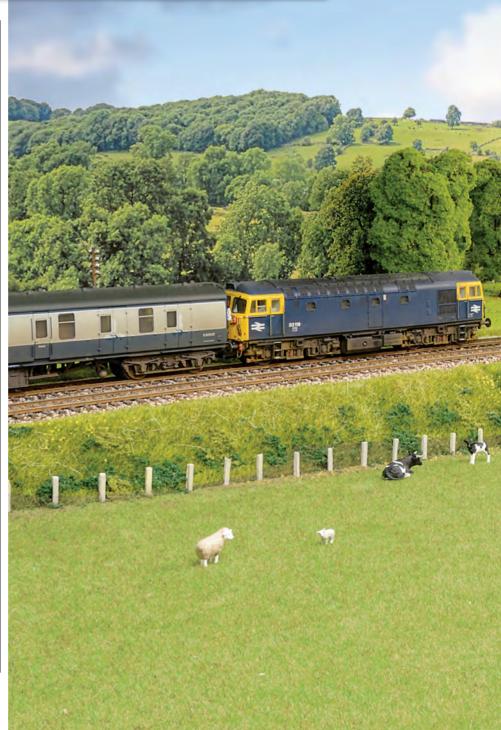
CONSTRUCTION

My loft has a trussed roof, which I was happy to work with. I was able to bridge the trusses with batons and put the baseboards on top using 9mm plywood all heavily braced and screwed together. The whole construction process took a while with the roof being insulated with 75mm Kingspan to start with and I also had two Velux windows fitted. It is definitely worth taking time at this stage as you cannot go back and retro-fit it all. This has paid dividends as the loft stays quite cool in summer and manages without heating in winter.

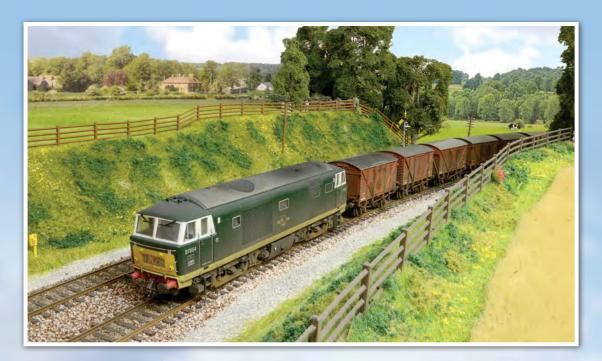
The track is all Peco - a mixture of codes 75 and 100 using converter sections between the two, usually around crossovers. Prior to ballasting the whole track layout was sprayed with Phoenix Rusty Rails, a great colour. I am lucky in having a lot of workmates with a similar interest and they have all been invaluable in giving advice and assistance especially when it came to wiring it all together – this was something that took quite a few visits!

The gentle rolling hills on the countryside section were created using hardboard sections cut to shape and screwed to blocks of wood of various sizes which gave me the nice smooth contours and transitions that I was trying to achieve. It took a while, but I was happy with the results. Under the hardboard are sections of polystyrene to give it a bit of strength and support.

The tunnel is a large plywood box section screwed together with the hardboard simply angled and screwed down on top of it. The grass on the fields is Gaugemaster mats cut to shape and fastened down using double-sided tape. The grass on the embankments and cuttings was created using Gaugemaster 6mm meadow mats which gave me the different colours and >>>

textures I was trying to achieve. This was then detailed with different scatter material to bring it to life. All buildings are mainly from either the Bachmann or Hornby ranges, all slightly weathered and tweaked. The smaller details really make a difference.

Spending time adding mileposts, gradient boards, track detail and general clutter transforms the look of the railway. It was definitely worth the time and effort to do it. The signals are all Peco lower quadrant. Once they are finished I remove the bases and drill a hole in the

baseboards so they can be planted properly. Finally, the height of them is set for the location so that the 'OO' gauge drivers can see them better. To me this individual touch makes them look more realistic.

POWER AND CONTROL

From the start of Exeter Junction it has been operated with Digital Command Control. I've kept things simple underneath and the whole layout is operated direct from a single Gaugemaster Prodigy base station to operate all sections. As a home layout, I

haven't found the need for power districts and it provides ample capacity to have a number of locomotives ticking over with sound on in the depot area while two trains are running on the main lines.

Brush prototype 1200 Falcon was a rare performer on passenger trains in the early 1970s. Following a rebuild at Swindon in 1970, it emerged in BR blue and went to Bristol Bath Road depot to work alongside the 'Westerns' before moving into South Wales for use on freight work. Here the unique twin-engined prototype arrives at Exeter Junction with a passenger working

powers away

the period I model. This is also a great excuse to buy a variety of different stock.

The latest addition is a rake of re-painted Hornby HTV hoppers which operated from the Westbury area for a while behind classes 45, 47 and 52. Class 33s also powered them back to the Southern Region while Class 42 'Warships' also hauled them for a short time on the M25 stone workings. There are plenty of options.

I would again like to thank some of the guys at work for their help and advice but especially my wife for her patience during the long building process.

The high street has been produced using a range of Bachmann and Hornby ready made buildings while the road is from Scalescenes' range of texture sheets.

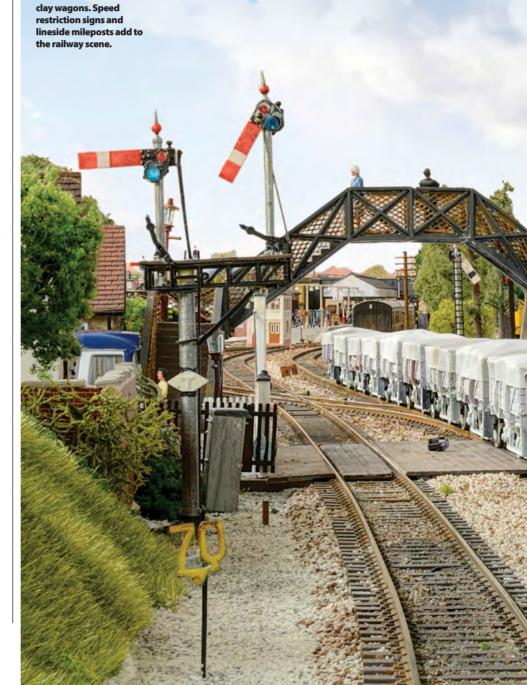
ROLLING STOCK

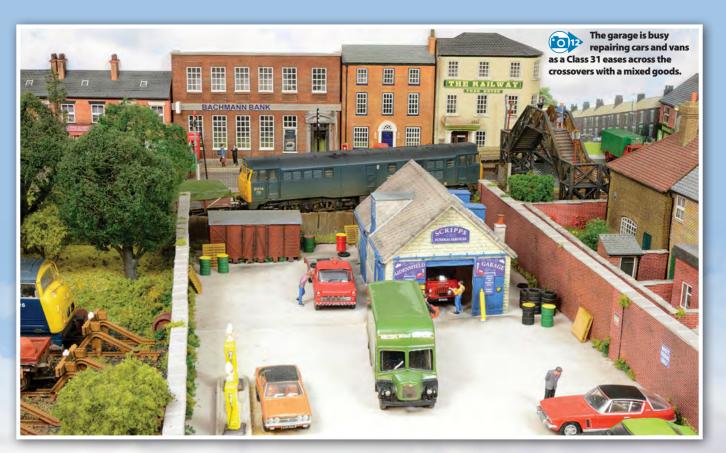
Trains are a selection from all the mainstream manufacturers. I do add small amounts of detail but not much. Rolling stock is weathered in the garage using an airbrush and vehicles are not allowed on the layout until it's been done. I use a variety of shades to avoid having a flat colour, especially on the running gear.

I always study photographs of locomotives from the 1970s with different paints and cleaning plants as they all weathered in different ways. This gives each locomotive a realistic but unique appearance.

Western Region diesel-hydraulics feature prominently in the roster including classes 22, 35, 42, 43 and 52 from the ranges of Bachmann, Dapol and Heljan. These are modelled in a number of liveries from the early 1970s including BR maroon with small yellow warning panels (Class 42 and 52), BR green with small yellow panels (Class 22 and 35) and BR blue with full yellow ends (Class 22, 42, 43 and 52). In addition the newly arrived diesel-electrics from classes 31, 33, 37, 45, 47 and 50 can all be seen running on the layout as well as Brush prototype 1200 Falcon in its final BR blue colour scheme.

Passenger traffic is mainly formed from a rake of Bachmann Mk 1s with the close coupling bars connected. These are joined by a Class 108 Diesel Multiple Unit and a Class 205 Diesel Electric Multiple Unit to provide stopping services. Freight stock from both Hornby and Bachmann covers a cross-section of what would have been seen in this part of the region. The obvious weathered china clay wagons without the hoods and six-wheel milk wagons can all be hauled by a variety of engines from classes 22, 25 and 'Warships' right through to classes 45, 46, 47, 50 and 52. This era also allows me to run pick-up goods with many still coming out of Cornwall during

A Brief History of our Plate & Bolster Wagons

Between 1937 and 1954 the LNER, LMS and BR built over 9,000 unfitted four wheel steel carrying wagons commonly known as Plate and Double Bolster wagons. The bodywork was either of welded or riveted construction and a variety of different axle boxes were used during the lifespan of the wagons. Block trains of these wagons were common throughout the network where steel was either produced or used in industry. Although built for carrying steel plate and larger steel products anchored to the bolsters they quickly found use carrying all manner of loads over the whole BR system. Many survived well into the TOPS era where they were used for a variety of departmental duties. The models being produced for us by Bachmann include examples in as built condition and those for departmental use. Many Double Bolster wagons were converted to Plate wagons but retained some of their bolster fittings, examples of these wagons are also included in the range.

HETHER you are looking for a computer-based Digital Command Control (DCC) system or a lighting solution for a rake of 'OO' gauge carriages, there is bound to be a digital product available to fit your needs. From decoder programming tools to point motors, sound decoders and smoke generators, each is designed to give you a better digital experience, most of which can be operated from a command centre or handset.

This ability to operate multiple locomotives, accessories and digital sound projects from a single controller is the reason many modellers have made the switch, and manufacturers have recognised this with plenty of new products which allow this versatile control system to keep doing more. That said, if you have a large layout and wish to develop a separate digital mimic control panel to control turnouts, signals and other accessories, there are products available to help you with that. If you want to add in a level of automatic control

or even locomotive detection, the technology is out there.

Digital sound has proved really popular with some impressive high-end offerings from the likes of Digitrains, Howes, Legomanbiffo, Locoman Sounds, South West Digital and more, offering improved functionality and control. The introduction of Hornby's Twin Track Sound decoders, offering digital sound on a budget, has helped stimulate the market further, encouraging more sampling of the medium before modellers commit to enhancing more of their motive power fleets.

The following selection lists 20 of the best digital products that we have used and regularly turn to when building digital layouts and upgrading rolling stock. We've tried and tested every single one, but even so this survey represents a snapshot of the full range available for a DCC layout. 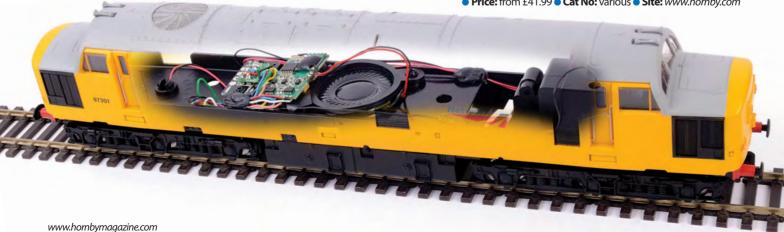

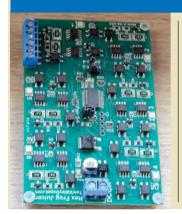

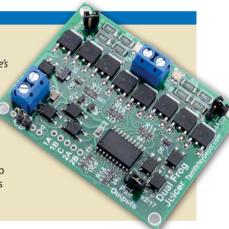

Sophisticated track plans can result in potentially complicated digital wiring, especially when coupled with live frog turnouts. Tam Valley's Hex Frog Juicer is just one tool that aims to reduce the headache by automatically reversing the polarity for up to six points or crossings and can also be used for reverse loop scenarios too.

Designed to prevent potential short circuits as metal wheels pass over turnout frogs, we

have found it to be reliable in regular use on *Hornby Magazine's* exhibition layouts, such as the complex trackwork on our'OO' gauge BR Southern Region layout, Twelve Trees Junction.

Although not the cheapest item on the market, it has six outputs and will handle DCC systems and booster outputs up to 10amps. Tam Valley produces similar dual frog and single frog juicers at lower prices.



REALTRACK MODELS '00' GAUGE DCC SOUND-FITTED CLASS 156 DMU

Realtrack Models' 4mm scale Class 156 two-car Diesel Multiple Unit (DMU) set a new benchmark for ready-to-run'OO' gauge DMUs when it first appeared in 2017.

Whilst available DCC ready and DCC-fitted, the model incorporates a highly detailed exterior and interior, directional lighting, interior illumination, operational Central Door Locking (CDL) lights and an impressive digital sound project - and it is the audio on this model that really stands out. The onboard decoder is configured to offer a choice of day and night running lights, parking lights and directional destination blind illumination, plus the audio project includes a raft of ancillary sounds with passenger door hustle alarms, door opening and closing sounds and even a lavatory flushing! A novel inclusion

is the sense of the doors opening and closing with the bodyside CDL lights illuminating/extinguishing in accordance with prototype practice. Add in engine sounds, guard to driver buzzers and even onboard announcements that can be customised through CV

changes to broadcast different destinations and you have an impressive and realistic model.



DEAD INTOW

At one time diesel shunters were often hauled 'dead' in freight trains on their way to and from works or between depots. **TIM SHACKLETON** finds a purpose for a non-working bargain Bachmann model by adapting it to fit the bill.

HIS BACHMANN MODEL of a Class 04 diesel shunter was an impossible-to-resist purchase at a local swapmeet. Impossible, not just because I like small diesel shunters but because, as a non-runner, it cost me buttons. Malfunctioning model railway locomotives of this or any other generation are pretty simple, both electrically and mechanically, and I don't usually have much trouble restoring

them to life. Once the '04' was dismantled, however, I could see why it was a non-runner – it didn't have a motor. Being the old split-frame design, it had lost most of the insulation between the two halves of the chassis and when I placed the locomotive on the track there was a dead short. The body, though, was fine despite the clunky handrails and the less-than-flush glazing. I could have built a new underframe for it – I

have a Branchlines kit for one, and High Level's Class 03 chassis could readily be adapted for an '04' – but these were both earmarked for a one-fine-day Wisbech & Upwell project. Instead I decided to model a Class 04 being moved 'dead' between depots or on its way to Works. This was once a common practice with shunters that couldn't move themselves or go fast enough not to get in the way of other trains – nowadays of course they go by road, on a low loader.

To travel by rail the process usually involved stripping off the rods and disengaging the drive, effectively treating the locomotive as an item of loose-coupled rolling stock (its brakes wouldn't be operative when being hauled dead). Nor was towing confined to failures – in the final days of the 'Deltics', one of the regular duties of the Gateshead allocation was to run out light along the East Coast Main Line on a Friday evening to collect the Tweedmouth Class 03 shunter and drag it back to base for fuel and servicing.

For most of my modelmaking I'm up to my neck in mud and bullets, building highly complicated kits and as often as not writing the instructions at the same time. That's why, as an antidote, I enjoy simple remedial/improvement projects like this that allow me to relax a bit and remind myself why I'm involved in this hobby in the first place. Scenic work has the same therapeutic effect, mostly because nothing needs to move or otherwise behave itself when current is applied. If you ever feel you've lost your modelling 'mojo', this is the kind of simple, easy-to-follow project that's sure to bring you round.



MODEL DREWRY OPTIONS

The Airfix 4mm scale kit for the Drewry shunter was released in 1961 and has been in continuous production ever since, latterly from Dapol. As so often, box artwork, prototype and actual model don't entirely agree on points of detail!





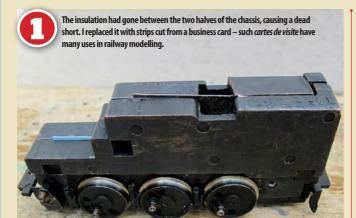


A Drewry shunter such as you might have found at work in the late 1950s – a couple of years old, clean and yet grubby all at the same time, plenty of signs of use, oil everywhere. Note the nuanced shades of weathering, especially below the running plate. This is the Bachmann Brassworks product in 7mm scale, repainted from the green version. Like the 'two-bob' Airfix kit, it incorporates features drawn from various prototype phases without being representative of any one in particular.

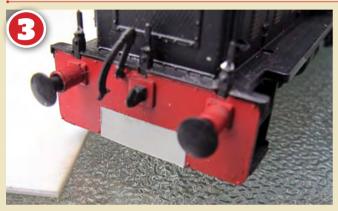
The Bachmann Class 04, although not quite up to present-day standards, and accurately representing only the final batch of these locomotives, is still an excellent model with a lot of potential. That's all I look for – I neither demand nor expect perfection.



STEP BY STEP UPGRADING A BACHMANN DREWRY CLASS 04 DIESEL SHUNTER IN 'OO'





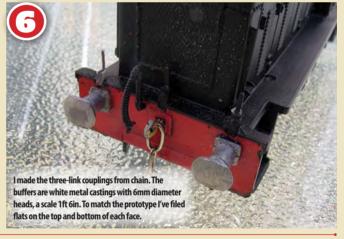

Turning to the cab and bonnet, I took off Bachmann's chunky plastic handrail stanchions with side-cutters, then drilled for new and much finer medium-length ones in turned brass from Alan Gibson. The way to fit them is first to thread them on to a length of wire with the ends bent at a right angle to stop them falling off. Push the stanchions into position, tweak as necessary and then snip off the excess. The handrails are actually in short sections with a half-inch gap between but in 4mm scale who would notice?

I've popped out the deeply recessed cab windows, removed the tampoprinted numbers by rubbing with them a wooden cocktail stick and filled the holes for the handrail knobs with Squadron green putty.



the first 75 of the dass compared to the later version on which Bachmann (and Airfix) based their models. I removed the tanks completely, cut off the steps, thinned them down drastically and then, having infilled the front section of the running plate, reattached them in a more accurate configuration. I made the new, shorter air tanks from half-round sprue from a plastic kit!

Details such as the front steps and air tanks were very different on

The front grabs are Alan Gibson's 'long' handrail stanchions with the holes filled with solder. The cabside handrails use the 'short' pattern with 0.45mm wire. I flush-glazed the cab using LaserGlaze by Extreme Etchings. It's easy enough to cut glazing to shape from clear plastic but the front windows could be tricky.



Many years ago, I'd systematically photographed the underframe of a Class 04 and these shots yielded a great deal of useful information for this project. Here we see brake block detail and the protective mesh behind the cab steps.





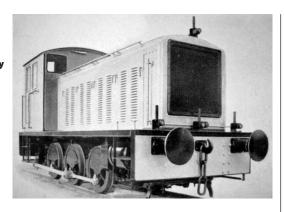
This particular locomotive arrived from Robert
Stephenson & Hawthorn's Newcastle works in
December 1956 as BR 11216. To suit my modelling
period I showed it as renumbered to D2246 in March
1959, still in its original black livery. From late 1957 all new-build
BR diesel shunters were delivered in Brunswick green but many
earlier locomotives retained their black paintwork (usually
obscured by layers of filth) for years to come. Some kept the early
'cycling lion' BR symbol when renumbered, others received the
new pattern. It was all very random. Livery changes are always
introduced gradually and there are rarely any clear cut-off points.

DREWRY PORTFOLIO

The prototype speculative venture by **Vulcan Foundry** in partnership with the **Drewry Car** Company, a sales organisation that mostly procured eauipment on clients' behalf rather than being



much of a locomotive builder in its own right. Originally known by its Drewry serial number of 2217, this 204hp 0-6-0 diesel-mechanical shunter began trials in June 1947. Painted in apple green with black and white lining, it was road-tested on LNER metals but moved to the Southern Region in October 1948. Having subsequently bought the locomotive outright, British Railways allocated it to the departmental fleet and gave it the number DS1173 which it carried until 1967, when it was moved into capital stock and renumbered D2341. Having achieved the unique distinction of becoming both the first and last member of the class, it was withdrawn in December 1968.



Repainted into green livery from the original black, D2211 is at Colchester around 1962, complete with 'wasp' stripes and warning flashes. Like all the first 15 Vulcan-built shunters – 11100-11115, later D2200-D2214 – it has fixings along the running plate for tramway skirts, although only a few would ever be running as tramway locomotives at any given moment. Although mechanically much the same as the later members of the class, this batch was outwardly so different as to be to all intents and purposes a separate sub-division. They had 3ft 3in wheels, shallow buffer beams, unusual flat-topped buffers and cabs with small drop windows; the bonnet top was in four sections but on later locomotives there were three. It would be a challenge to model one of these using the Bachmann or Airfix model as the basis.



D2215 was the first of the 3ft 6in engines built with modified cab and the deeper buffer beam found on most class members. Sub-contracted from the Drewry Car Company, 11121-11160 (D2215-D2241) were assembled at Vulcan Foundry, after which production of the class switched briefly to Robert Stephenson & Hawthorn's Scotswood Works in Newcastle-upon-Tyne (11212-11219, later D2242-D2249). All subsequent engines (D2260-D2340) were completed at the RSH Darlington factory between 1957 and 1962. D2215 is seen at Colchester depot around 1962. Originally in plain black and numbered 11121, it's now in green livery with 'wasp stripes'.

D2246 was one
of a small batch
(11212-11219 later
D2242-D2249) built
by RSH in 1956 for the
North Eastern Region.
Note the whistle on
the cab front. They had
the 3ft 6in wheels of
the later builds but,
uniquely, still had
shallow buffer beams
like those on the early
Drewry shunters, as
well as the original



style of buffers with flattened-off tops – some later acquired the small, round pattern. Like all Drewry shunters up to 11229 (D2259) this batch was delivered in black livery with the 'cycling lion' emblem. D2260-D2273 arrived from RSH Darlington in plain green with the later emblem but with steam-style Gill Sans numerals. Diesel-style serif numbers were applied to all new deliveries from D2274 onwards and all renumbering was in this style.



Comparatively few Drewry shunters received blue livery and all were withdrawn before the introduction of the TOPS system (under which they would have become Class 04). Here D2258, freshly outshopped, shunts Litchurch Lane C&W works in Derby on August 26 1967. Sold to the NCB a year later, it retained blue livery until scrapped in the mid-1980s. Only recently transferred from the Southern Region, it retains its extra SR-pattern marker lights.

MUCH LOVED LAYOUT LOOKING FOR A NEW HOME



The layout is fixed along two walls, 10 ft along the back, and 8 ft along the side, just short of 3 ft wide. There are four independently running circuits, each about 10m round, three at ground level and the fourth running over and round in a figure of eight, plus sidings. There are engines and much rolling stock, night lighting, buildings, vehicles, reed switches wired for Station Stop Modules and point motors. Two dual controllers and so much else besides including unusually, perhaps uniquely, no track pins. The rails are held in Gaugemaster track underlay. The base boards are covered in fibre-bonded carpet and it has the effect of holding the underlay like Velcro. No need to risk undulations in the track where pins are too heavily hammered in!

I do not wish to sell it to be broken up and sold. I would be prepared to give the layout free to anyone who would take it to re-site it, run it, and develop it further. Reluctantly parting with it due to home renovations meaning I no longer have space to keep it.

A tribute to an overlooked GCR hero

HANK YOU for the excellent article on the Great Central Railway (HM135). I would like to bring to your attention someone who has long been overlooked in the building of the London extension and many other projects around the world. His name is Sir Robert William Perks (1849-1934).

He was for many years legal advisor to Sir Edward Watkin until his death in 1901. He was also the legal advisor to the Metropolitan Railway until he was elected chairman in 1901 to oversee the electrification of the railway. He was very close to Sir Edward Watkin in all his major railway projects, drafting the legislation for submission to Parliament. He did, though, disagree with Sir Edward on one major matter and that was the funding of the London extension.

Perks proposed extending the Metropolitan Railway north to Rugby to meet the London extension there. This seemed to Sir Robert to be the most sensible way to fund the project as the Metropolitan was profitable. He was, though, overruled and Watkin got his way. I feel the shareholders in the Great Central Railway may not have lost their investment if Perks' recommendation had been adopted.

These were not the only projects Sir Robert Perks was involved with. Other projects included the privatisation of the Conway Suspension Bridge (circa 1878), Barry Docks and Railways in South Wales (1889), Manchester Ship Canal (1893), the first Channel Tunnel (1876-1882) as well as overseas dock and railway projects.

In 1905-1906 he was requested to address the Royal Commission on Transport in London. He recommended a tax on vehicles that use the roads to be used to repair them. He also recommended that to relieve traffic congestion in London a great boulevard should be built around London!

He was a great man and I would recommend that you download his biography. It is well worth reading.

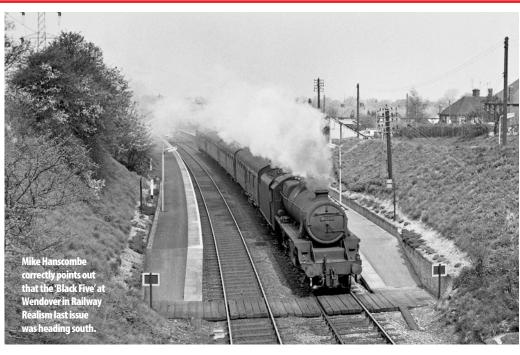

One notable feature was the northbound Home signal which I remember being at the top of the embankment on the outside of the curve (nearer to the southbound line) for better visibility. On the model, the back of it can be seen above the road bridge.

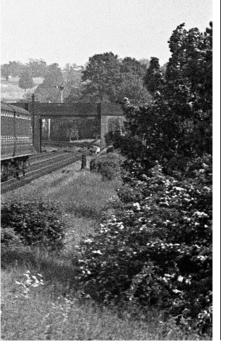

INTENTIO LASER CUT PLATELAYERS

Laser cut buildings and accessories are growing in popularity and they are simple to assemble too. **MIKE WILD** builds Intentio's 4mm scale model of the LNER concrete platelayers hut.

IT BUILDING is a great way to pass an evening or two and introduce individuality to a model railway. Sometimes it's too easy to find a ready made building off the shelf and ready to go, but the impact and value of building your own models can't be underestimated.

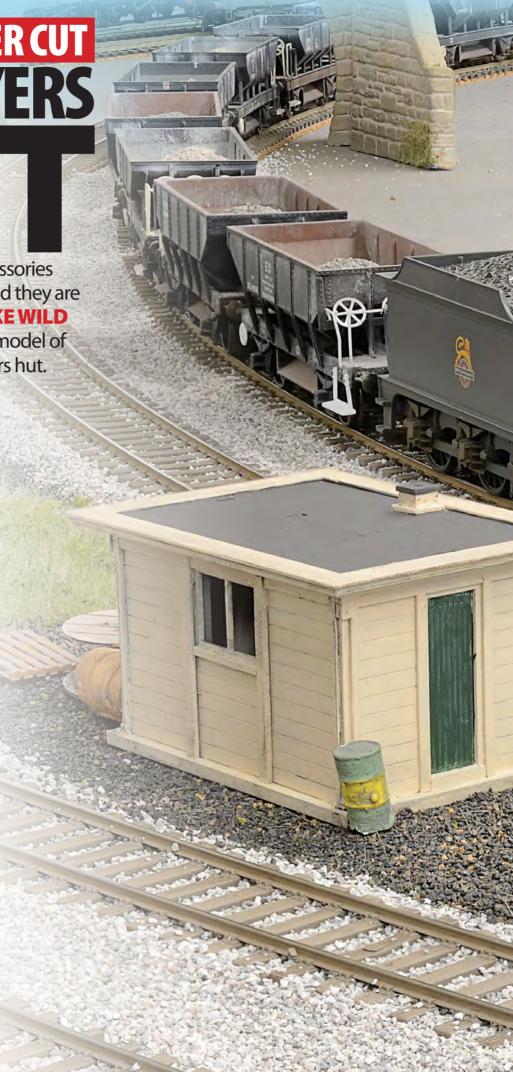
This simple London and North Eastern Railway (LNER) platelayers hut is amongst the latest laser cut products to be produced by Intentio. This supplier has generally been associated with 7mm scale products, but has begun reducing some of its designs to suit 4mm and even 2mm scale as well. This project uses the new 4mm scale version of the LNER Type D hut which is available in a number of lengths to suit different requirements. Prices start from £20. Our kit is a three bay type.

One of the beauties of laser cut kits is that they fit together cleanly and simply. Slot and tab connections are used for the main parts which makes it straightforward to get everything in the right position so long as you identify the parts early on. Only one connection needed opening out on our kit where the roof fitted over the internal supports.

For our build we used Deluxe Materials Glue 'n' Glaze adhesive which we have found ideal for bonding laser cut kits in the past as it flows into the joints and dries clear too – an important point.

Painting was completed in four stages: undercoating with Halfords grey car primer, top coating with Lifecolor Lime Mortar (Cat No. UA742) for the concrete panels, finishing of the roof with Lifecolor Worn Black (UA734) and the door with the same manufacturer's BR Standard Loco Green (UA814) followed by weathering with Lifecolor Railway Liquid Pigments set.

The result is a building which looks the part and will stand out from the crowd. It has been set into a scene on Topley Dale at the junction to bring a new area of life and detail to this developing 'OO' gauge layout. Ground cover is DCC Concepts black cinder ballast combined with Woodland Scenics fine cinder ballast while the ballast bins are by Skytrex and the figures and wheelbarrows are from Dart Castings.

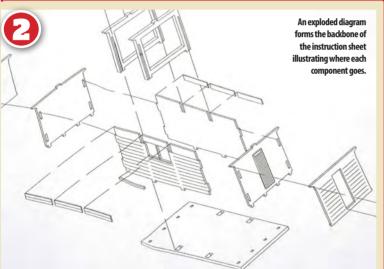

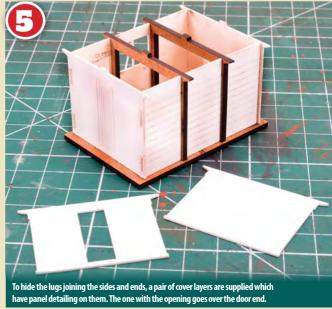
BUILDING AN INTENTIO LAMP HUT IN 4mm SCALE

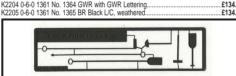

Grosvenor Square's

The Hornby Magazine team is always looking to enhance its layouts and this month it was the turn of our Western Region terminus to prepare it for its next appearance at the Great Electric Train Show on October 13/14. MIKE WILD reveals why and how this large layout has been taken to the next level.

GWR'King' 4-6-0 6029 King Edward VIII

ROSVENOR SQUARE was always supposed to be longer than when we first exhibited it. At the time there weren't enough hours in the day to build the original planned 16ft length and instead it was restricted to 12ft for the scenic section to suit both the 2017 Hornby Magazine Yearbook and the layout's debut exhibition appearance at the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition in November 2016. Since then it has been popular on its

public showings which included the Great Central Railway Model Event and Spalding Model Railway Exhibition in 2017, even though we always knew that it had a compromise in the way it operated. Its appearance at the Spalding show also gave rise to a new guise for the layout - on the Saturday we stuck to our usual 1960s BR steam-diesel transition sequence, but on the Sunday of the event we moved the clock forward to the end of the 1960s when BR blue was seen alongside maroon. It went down well, but with Twelve Trees Junction firmly in the limelight for our show appearances in 2018, Grosvenor Square has taken a back seat. That is until now.



This layout started out with the idea to build a large terminus. It would be served by the Western Region from the south and the London Midland Region from the north. Its location is suggested as the Midlands, but nowhere too specific to allow plenty of flexibility in the locomotives and rolling stock which work in and out of the station.

The original period was set as the 1960s, primarily focused on the years between 1960-1965 when steam was seeing out its final years on the Western and dieselhydraulics were becoming more common.

The station layout consists of seven platforms. Three have run-round loops available while the centre four are dead ends, adding to the operational potential of the layout. In addition there are three long sidings to the rear of the station, a pair of

DMU/ carriage sidings to the front and the suggestion

of a depot entrance next to the entrance/exit from the storage yard.

The platforms are made from 12mm MDF on top of two layers of ¹/¹ein cork to get the levels right while the brick facing is Redutex textured and pre-coloured self-adhesive resin sheets. The platform surface is made from Slater's paving plasticard suitably coloured with greys from Tamiya and a light weathering with Geoscenics black concentrate let down with water.

Perhaps the most impressive part of the station is the terminus building and its canopies. These were built by Tim Shackleton and consist of the Walthers American outline Grand Central station building, suitably anglicised and weathered together with no fewer than seven Peco overall roof sections to provide cover over the main platforms. In combination these elements give the sense of a large terminus, and one which is still busy too.

The overall footprint of the original scenic section is 12ft x 3ft made up of three 4ft x 3ft baseboards which was then expanded with the addition of a 9ft x 8ft return loop storage yard (HM116) bringing the total footprint up to 21ft x 8ft. However, the original plan called for a fourth 4ft long baseboard. This would include the inbound junctions allowing trains on the slow or fast lines to access all seven platforms and all departing trains to access the fast and slow lines in the opposite direction — something that the 12ft format restricts in certain cases.

These restrictions are one of the primary reasons for making the extension for Grosvenor Square, as it will make operation more realistic and allow a proper flow of trains through the storage yard.

DIGITAL OPERATION

From the get-go Grosvenor was designed to work with Digital Command Control (DCC) and it was been wired so that all >>>

track sections are live at all times. This is particularly important for the operation of the sound equipped locomotives which form the roster for the layout as it means that no matter where they are parked on the layout their sounds can be left on or lights switched on and off to more accurately reflect real railway operation.

The wiring underneath consists of two main power feeds – one for the track connections and one for the points. The latter is also split into two separate sections – one for the scenic section and one for the storage yard. All this means that Grosvenor is flexible in its operation, but also complex on the electrical and control front.

To bring Grosvenor Square into service requires a Gaugemaster Prodigy system with at least six handsets – the maximum number of operators the layout can support – two Hornby Elite controllers and two computers running Hornby's RailMaster software. The Prodigy takes care of all locomotive movements on the track, but it cannot change points or signals – that role is left to the computers connected to the Elites which in turn are connected to the two point motor power buses. One is dedicated to the scenic section and oversees all movements around the station while the second is allocated to the storage yard and that operator is responsible for ensuring that incoming trains have a space to enter and that outbound trains are always ready to depart to keep the flow of traffic moving on the scenic section.

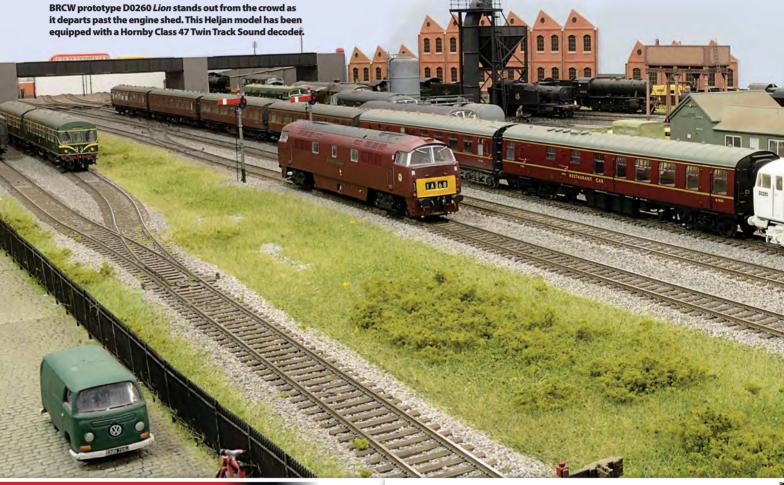
It is an intensive layout to operate under exhibition conditions, but enthralling as there is always another train ready to depart or arrive at the station, or just simply a light engine movement that needs to take place to clear a line.

EXTENSION PLAN

We've wanted to add the extra baseboard into Grosvenor Square since its first showing, but the time hasn't been right until now to bring the project to fruition. However, in the end we didn't just add one 4ft long section, we added two to take this layout up to 29ft in length with a 20ft long scenic area.

The plan we hatched was to incorporate the 24hr challenge roundhouse scene into the expansion of Grosvenor Square in a second challenge against the clock. We don't mind admitting that this project took more than the 24 working hours we had originally planned – it became more of a 36hr project – but it was all time well spent.

The build commenced in the second half of August with the deadline of the end of the month to allow this feature to be compiled on Grosvenor Square. It

would add 8ft in total to the layout, but to incorporate the shed it meant that the boards would have to be widened to just over 4ft to accommodate the four-track main line running across the front as well as extension of the carriage sidings.

Production of the baseboards was swift. We built a new 4ft long board which widened from 3ft at one end to 4ft 2in at the other and then built a second 4ft x 20in baseboard for the main lines to pass in front of the roundhouse board. All of these were built using 9mm plywood for the surface and 69mm x 18mm planed timber for the frames to match the existing boards.

These were all then bolted together with the original roundhouse board and sandwiched between the last of the original scenic section baseboards and the first of the storage yard. Now we had a blank canvas, but fortunately the trackplan for the





first 4ft of the main line had already been designed during the original construction phase. It included two double slips and four large radius points to give trains access to all platforms and exit routes. The main lines on the second board were simple too – 4ft of four track plain line which will give somewhere for our extensive fleet of sound equipped locomotives to stretch their legs a little as they leave the station.

The trackplan to join up with the original depot was a little less planned. It developed as we built the layout and went on with the aim of reflecting a locomotive yard leading to the turntable to allow incoming train engines to be shunted from the station over an ashpit, through a coaling plant, to a water tower and then the turntable. Once on the turntable engines would have the option to go on shed for stabling, or simply be turned ready for their next duty and be held on the departure line. In the end we added two extra through lines to make it easier to get the right locomotives ready for specific train types. The new depot area will certainly keep one of our operating team very busy during show weekends.

DEVELOPING THE SCENERY

One of the advantages of this new scene is that the scenery is quite simple. At least 60% of the surface is covered by track and ultimately the ground cover would revolve.

around ballast. It was how to detail the areas in front and behind the railway which provided the challenge, but the answer came in recycling buildings from another project which was unlikely to see the light of day the micro layout that we built for HM117.

This layout worked well, but it had become homeless and had ended up in storage. We had put a lot of time and effort into painting the low relief buildings and warehouses which adorned this 4ft x 18in layout and it seemed a shame for them never to be seen. All are from the Skytrex range and we were able to remove all the buildings from the micro layout as well as some of the hardstanding ground cover for a new life on Grosvenor Square. The micro yielded a series of single and

double storey north light factory buildings, a large amount of brick walling and two three storey warehouses. One of these found a new home on the front of the Grosvenor extension while the other was partially dismantled to allow it to be used as a low relief structure behind the shed in the back corner. The northlight buildings were used in a near identical arrangement to their time on the micro layout, but this time as the backdrop to the locomotive yard. With the background sorted we decided on concrete fencing for the foreground ahead of the carriage stabling sidings - which also gained a run-round loop and headshunt

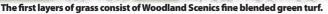
in the new plan - leaving just the middle ground to make interesting and realistic. The main line section took care of itself as the trackwork is busy enough on its own, but the depot needed features to make it work.

First up was a diesel fuel facility. This came from two sources: a Bachmann Scenecraft fuelling point which we had acquired sometime before to go with the depot and a Faller fuel storage facility from Gaugemaster which was built up from the plastic kit. This was positioned to look as though it was a relatively new addition to the depot area to facilitate operation of diesel-hydraulics from the Western Region as well as the diesel electric interlopers from the London Midland Region.

Next up were servicing facilities for steam traction. We needed a pit, coal and water to fulfil the main functions of ash disposal and refuelling. The pit was assembled from a Peco kit for code 75 rail and then set into >>>



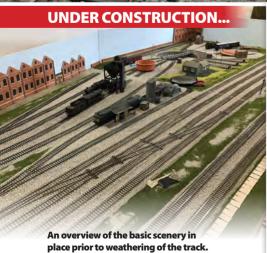

a hole cut out with a jigsaw to allow it to sit flush with the baseboard surface. Next was coal for which we turned to the Ratio range by building the Coaling Tower kit (Cat No. 547) which felt just the right size for the layout without dominating the scene. Water is provided by Kernow Model Rail Centre's GWR pattern Scenecraft model which ties in nicely with the roundhouse sections from the same source.

Ground cover consists of Woodland Scenics blended grey ballast, lots of it, in medium and fine grades. This was used across all areas to allow the colouring of the shed area to be blended into the rest of the layout using an airbrush. The ballast was laid loose using a Proses ballast spreader which drastically reduced the amount of time required to prepare the ballast for gluing with a 50:50 mix of PVA and water with a drop of detergent added to aid its flow into the loose ballast. As always we wetted the ballast with a water mister before applying any glue as this stops the ballast from moving when the glue is applied.

WEATHERING AND DETAILING

Having created all the basics it was time to start making Grosvenor Square look like a real railway. Chief amongst our tasks was weathering of the track and ballast. The rails and sleepers had already been sprayed with Humbrol No. 29 prior to ballasting on the main line and Railmatch roof dirt in the shed area, but the newly laid ballast now needed toning down too.

For this big job we use Geoscenics black concentrate let down with water. This is sprayed onto the layout using an airbrush – a perfect task for the Sparmax GP-850 which we review on pages 90-91 of this issue, as its large 125ml colour cup is ideal for this type of work. We filled it up and worked progressively on the track to soften the bright colour of the main lines and to really tone down the shed yard.

In some areas we have aimed to get the shed track and ballast thick with black concentrate to represent where locomotives have stood, but that was only the start for this area. We also went on to add Woodland Scenics fine cinders around the ash pit as well as Geoscenics crushed coal in the coaling tower and around its footing – the latter to suggest spilt coal during loading.



A '64XX' 0-6-0PT draws into the headshunt for the carriage sidings as a 'Hall' 4-6-0 and 'Western' hydraulic pass on the main lines. The shed yard is busy preparing locomotives for the next departures.

In some places this has been built as close as possible to the level of the rail heads, just as it would be at a real steam shed.

Another feature we were pleased with in the shed yard is the road crossing through it to reach the mess rooms. This was made by cutting lengths of code 75 rail and bending the ends to create check rails. Woodland Scenics blended grey fine grade ballast was then built up to the level of the rails and between the check rails to create a roadway

a feature which breaks up the site well.
 Away from the shed the grassed areas were detailed with MiniNatur and Green
 Scene static grasses topped off with
 Woodland Scenics blended green fine turf and various shades of coarse turf held in place with extra strong hairspray.

Ratio concrete fencing was added along the front of the layout to create a boundary between the railway and public land while in other places Ratio spear fencing has been used to separate railway land from other areas.

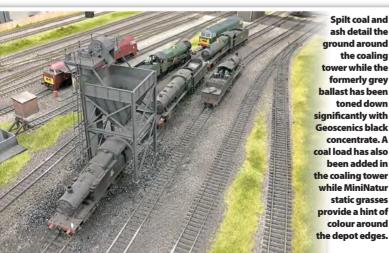
The finishing touches all came from our detailing box including packing cases outside the warehouse, railway paraphernalia around the shed yard and road vehicles from the Oxford Diecast range.

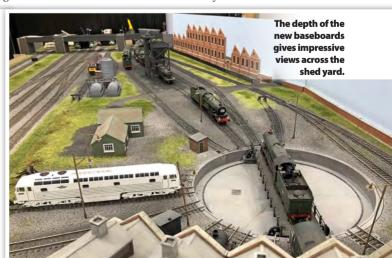
BACK IN THE LIMELIGHT

DIGITAL DIGITAL

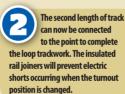
Following on from last issue's introduction to analogue loop wiring, **MIKE WILD** illustrates how a loop can be wired for permanent live operation of both tracks with digital control.

DIAGRAM 1

STEP BY STEP WIRING A LOOP FOR DIGITAL OPERATION



The first step is to add metal rail joiners to the outer rails and insulated rail joiners to the inner rails on a point at each end of the loop. The other end of the point has metal rail joiners fitted.

BASIC ELECTRICS

IGITAL COMMAND CONTROL wiring allows a more realistic railway to be built with a few simple wiring techniques. Like most model railway electrical wiring, once you have the method it is a case of repeating the same procedures to join everything together and the technique shown here can be used over and over.

When building a digital powered layout one of the fundamentals is making all the track live. We do this so that locomotives, multiple units and even carriages can maintain contact with the digital power source meaning that even when stationary in a loop, lights and

sounds can be left on. It also means that we no longer rely on switches, as with analogue, to control where the power goes – power simply goes to every section of track and means we are driving the trains and not the track.

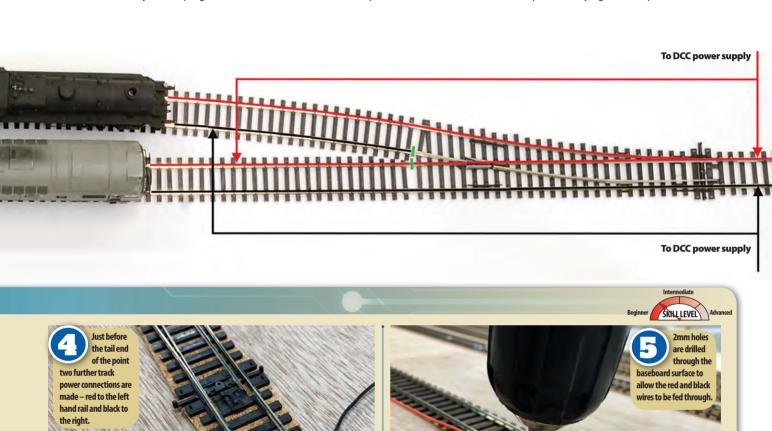
Making a loop, or indeed siding, live is a very simple process which requires the addition of two insulated rail joiners on each point positioned on the inner rails of the toe end of the turnout. This is illustrated in Diagram 1 by the green marks and in Step 1 below. These stop conflicts of power through the point frog. For a loop the point at the opposite end needs to be treated the same.

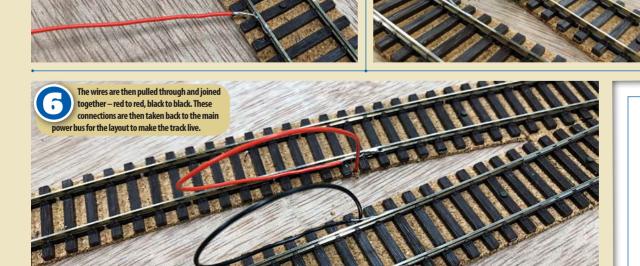
Next we need to power the now isolated

sections of track by adding feeds as shown in Diagram 1. These are connected back to the power feed on the main track and in turn to the controller. As we are using a digital controller commands to move locomotives are directed to individual locomotive decoders meaning that only the engine we want to move will move even though everything is live.

We have used this process in all of Hornby Magazine's digital controlled layouts and the results are excellent. Trains run reliably and, most importantly, operation is much more realistic.

The step by step guide illustrates the sequence in laying out a loop.

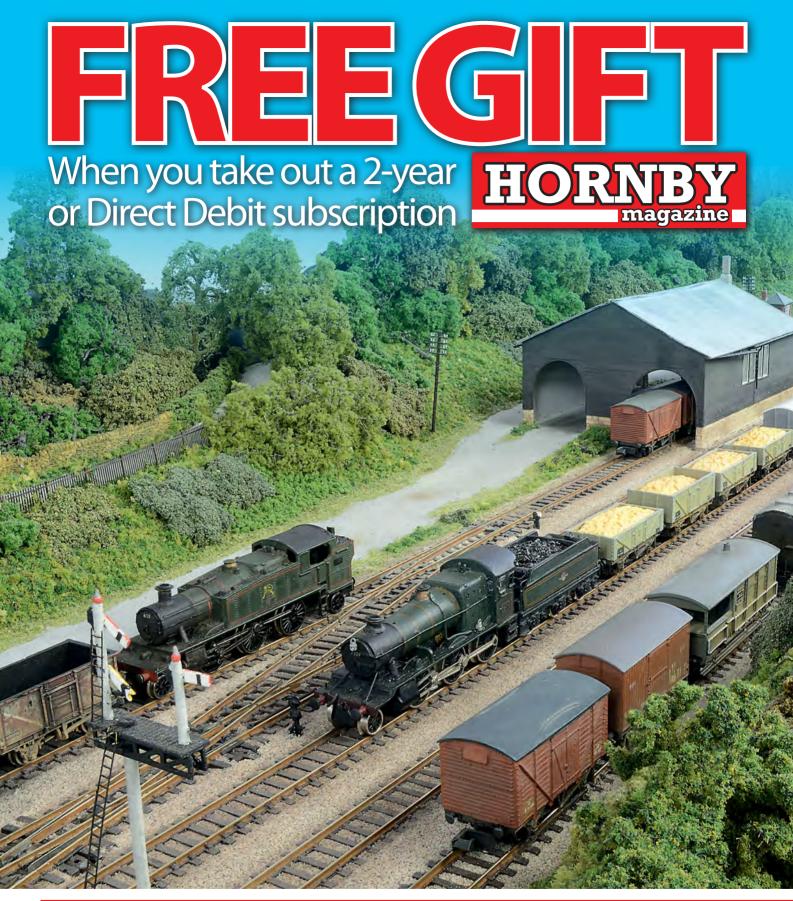

Bachmann's 'OO' gauge model of the Brighton 'H2' 4-4-2 has been a long time coming, but has it been worth the wait? **MIKE WILD** takes a closer look at 32424 *Beachy Head* in immaculate BR lined black.

LL GOOD THINGS come to those who wait and that is certainly true of the Bachmann 'OO' gauge model of the Brighton 'H2' 4-4-2. It was announced in the 2014 catalogue, but has taken four years to reach our desks for inspection – and we've been looking forward to this 'Atlantic' making its debut ever since it was first revealed by Bachmann.

The Brighton built 'H2' 4-4-2s had great character and were a follow up to the original Marsh designed 'H1' series which dates back to 1906. The first of the 'H2s' were constructed in 1911 – built at Brighton works for the London, Brighton & South Coast Railway (LBSCR) – and

they continued in front line service until the mid-1920s when the Southern Railway 'King Arthurs' entered service. Happily most of the 'H2s' survived into the British Railways era with 32424 *Beachy Head* being the last of the class to be steamed in 1958. You can read the full story of the 'H1' and 'H2'4-4-2s in Reality Check on pages 76-79.

The long gestation for the Bachmann 'H2' has had an advantage though as the manufacturer has also gone on to develop the 'H1' 4-4-2s alongside its original planned production of the 'H2' – the forerunners differing most obviously in the shaping of the running plate as well as other details.

For review we received a sample of the last 'H2' 32424 Beachy Head in BR lined black with small early crests on the tender sides. This is the condition that the locomotive was withdrawn in 1958 and also the livery that the new build of 32424 at the Bluebell Railway is being finished.

THE MODEL

32424 is superbly turned out in British Railways mixed traffic lined black on this version (Cat No. 31-921). The boiler bands are finely reproduced while the frame, splasher, cabside and tender has full three-colour lining just as it should. The smokebox numberplate stands proud of the

smokebox door while the nameplates are printed over the rear driving wheels. Etched replacements are included with the model which also comes with a full set of bufferbeam pipes, dummy screw link couplings, a selection of Southern Region route indictor discs and a set of fireirons to further enhance the already impressively detailed model.

Externally the detailing is first class including separate handrails, lamp irons, smokebox door dart, sprung buffers of the correct pattern, a neatly produced chimney and

dome, safety valves, whistle and more.

The boiler position, shaping and size all look spot on while the running plate is the correct shape for the 'H2' which was less intricate in its design than the earlier 'H1'. The cab features flush glazing to the front while the open rear gives a full view of the interior which is fully furnished

with pipework, screw reverser, regulator, fire hole door and a moveable fallplate to cover the gap between the locomotive and tender. All it needs is a crew to complete this area visually.

At the rear the tender has a cast metal coal load which can be removed to reveal the full relief coal space. Removal also gives a better view of the open coal rails at the rear and will allow a real crushed coal load to be added instead.

The underframe of the locomotive and

neatly produced chimney and

tender are both fully detailed with brake shoes, brake rigging (all factory fitted) and sand pips to the driving wheels. Correctly for a Southern)

engine the tender has no water scoop as the region didn't have water troughs.

PERFORMANCE

The technical specification for the 'Atlantic' follows Bachmann's standard practice. It has pick-ups on the driving and tender wheels, a powerful five-pole open frame motor in the locomotive, a 21-pin decoder socket in the tender plus a capacitor attached from the factory to operate with decoders which support 'stay alive' circuits.

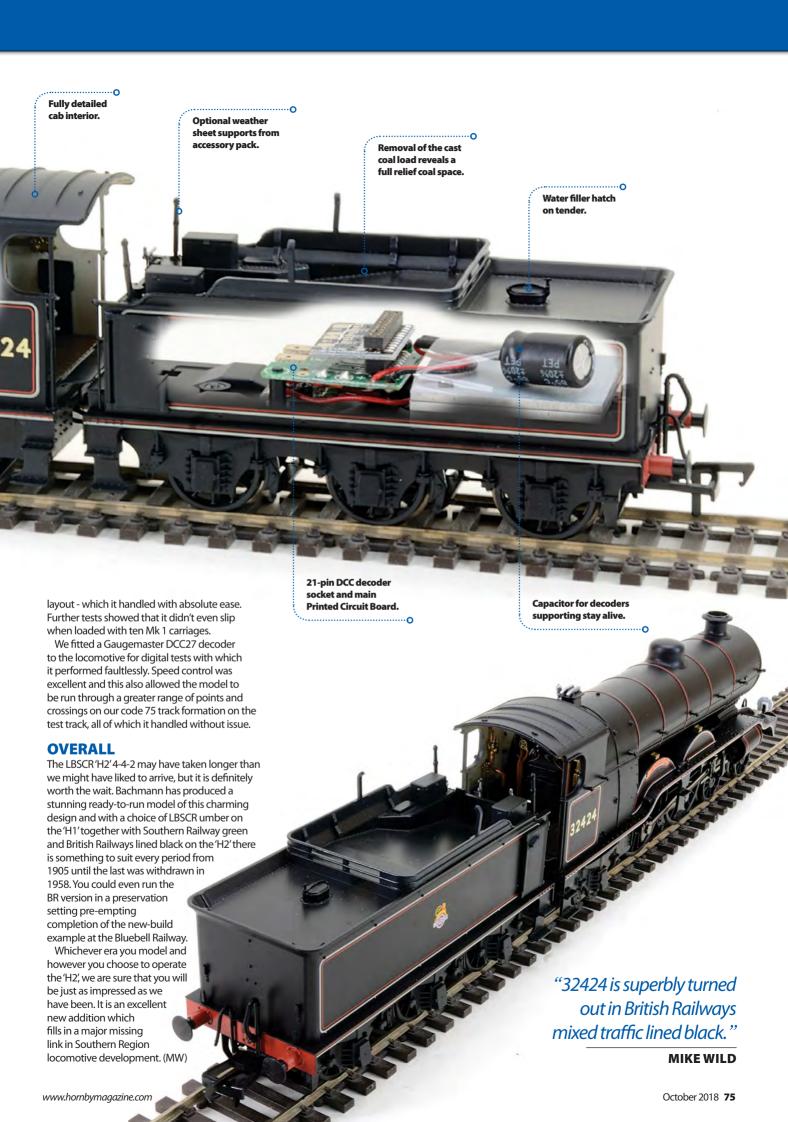
There is also space for a 23mm round speaker at the rear of the tender which requires removal of the two metal weights. This arrangement is near identical to the Great Northern Railway 'Atlantic' produced for Locomotion Models in

2015 (HM96), except that the main circuit board has been positioned the opposite way around.

We put our sample through its paces under analogue control initially, running it in first for 30 minutes in each direction before loading it with a train. We then subjected it to continuous running for a full day with a rake of seven coaches - a standard train length on our office

THE BRIGHTON Atlantics

On Britain's railways it was rare for the designs of one company to be adopted by another, but the 'H1' and 'H2' 4-4-2s of the LBSCR were exceptions. They owed as much to the Doncaster Works as they did to Brighton as **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** explains.

HE LONDON, BRIGHTON & South Coast Railway (LBSCR) was, in Victorian days, considered to be one of the premier lines in the south of England. Its wellloaded express trains ran between the capital and the wealthy areas of the coast, and also served important cross-Channel

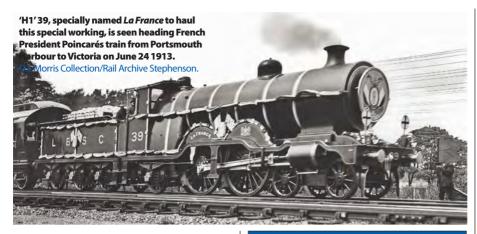
ferry routes. In 1904 the company recruited Douglas Earle Marsh as Locomotive Superintendant and he found that the locomotives being used for the most prestigious workings were desperately in need of an upgrade, with immediate replacement of some being a priority.

Most people in Marsh's position would have set about designing a locomotive of their own from scratch but in this case he took the unusual step of obtaining a set of drawings from Doncaster for one of the latest Ivatt Great Northern Railway 4-4-2s, and putting that into production with only a few modifications. This formed

had been heavily involved with the design of the Great Northern's 'Atlantics'. It was therefore likely that he saw the type with which he was already familiar as the ideal solution to the LBSCR's problems.

Such was the haste to get the locomotives constructed that the contract was let out to Kitson and Co who were merely supplied with a set of Doncaster drawings with Marsh's changes marked on them from which to work. The main difference between the Doncaster and the Brighton

REALITY CHECK



INITIAL ORDERS

Five locomotives were ordered at a cost of £3,950 each and all were in service by February 1906, with deliveries being made to Battersea and Brighton. Despite the short wheelbase and the use of two outside cylinders, running proved to be very smooth, the type also being free steaming and having good acceleration. Once commissioned all five were allocated to Brighton and were set to work on the fastest and heaviest expresses, including the Pullmans, many of which were even then scheduled to travel between the coast and London in a time of exactly one hour. In performing these duties speeds of 85mph and more were often achieved.

As delivered 'H1' class 'Atlantics' 37-39 had short cab roofs but following complaints from crews 40-41 were built with a longer version, but the first three retained the original arrangement for some years afterwards. 37 and 38 suffered a number of issues with overheated trailing axleboxes but this was soon satisfactorily resolved and the five engines settled down to give mileages of between 30,000 and 40,000 per year. As built the locomotives had bogie brakes fitted but these were soon found to be troublesome and were quickly removed while a further modification was the fitting of steam heat equipment which took place in October 1908.

The 'H1s' soon began to be regarded as the line's prestige engines and 39 was considered to be the best of them all, being chosen for all royal and VIP duties, including for a visit of the French President, Raymond Poincaré, in 1913 for which it was specially named *La France*.

When Marsh stood down in February 1911 due to ill health further express locomotives were already being discussed but again, rather than go for something new, his successor Lawson Billinton or LB Billinton as he is more commonly known, plumped for something tried and tested and in April 1911 he ordered six more 'Hs'. This time Brighton works provided the engines and once again there were some differences from earlier models.

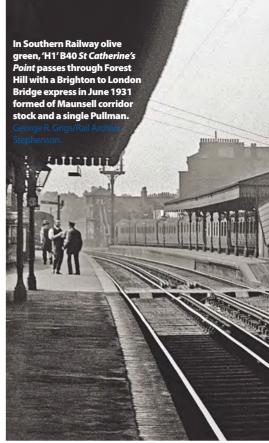
MODIFIED DESIGN

What were to become known as the 'H2s' were fitted with superheated boilers and larger cylinders and could be distinguished from the earlier 'H1s' by the footplate which had fewer undulations in it. Because of the superheating the boiler pressure was

reduced to 170psi, with the intention of reducing maintenance costs, but in the event when superheating was added to the earlier 'H1s', 200 psi became the standard pressure employed. Of the new engines 421 and 425 were sent to Brighton, Battersea received 422 and 426 while Eastbourne acquired 423 and 424. Again they were employed on top-link express duties and they proved both popular and reliable performers.

After the grouping of 1923 the locomotives lost their umber livery in favour of Maunsell dark green although all were not dealt with



straight away, while two years later in 1925 following an initiative by the Southern's publicity department all the 'H1s' and 'H2s' were given names reflecting south coast landmarks, with 39's being changed from La France to Hartland Point. Another change made was that the engines were fitted with vacuum brakes to enable them to be used more widely on the Southern system, but a barrier to wider use was that the class was outside the restricted Eastern Section loading gauge: as a result in 1935-1937 some alternations were made to reduce the overall height and width. These included changing the chimney for the Ashford 'U1' pattern, lowering the dome cover, safety valves and cab roof and more.

The 'Atlantics' remained in control of principal expresses until the arrival of Maunsell's 'King Arthurs' in 1925-1926 at which point a number were transferred to Eastbourne and Bognor where they were deployed over the Mid-Sussex route. Electrification of the central section of the Southern in 1933 found the class displaced further with some deployed to New Cross while the German occupation of France

in 1940 saw an abrupt halt to the cross-Channel ferry work, resulting in some being placed into store. In November six went to Basingstoke to replace some 'N15s' that had been loaned to the Great Western while others went to Salisbury and Southampton.

By 1944 all were back at Brighton for London services once again except for 2040-2041, originaly 'H1s', which were withdrawn at the start of the year with almost a million miles each on the clock. In 1947 'H1' 2039 was employed as a mobile test bed for Bulleid's 'Leader' programme being fitted with sleeve valve gear, different cylinders and outside steam pipes, while that summer saw four examples moved to Newhaven for boat train work.

Although all but two of the class survived into state ownership in 1948, 'H2' 2423 was quickly withdrawn due to cracked frames and worn-out cylinders while the rest acquired British Railways numbers and black livery, despite spending much of their time in store. In 1951 the three remaining 'H1s' were condemned and broken up at Eastleigh, authority was actually given for the 'H2s' to follow but in the event they were retained and spent a lot of time working parcels specials and relief passenger trains.

LAST OF THE LINE

In May 1956 the five surviving engines were suddenly taken out of service for bogie frame inspection as a result of an accident to Eastern Region 4-6-4 60700 which had a similar bogie and this led to 32421 and 32426 being withdrawn while 32422 was put on light duties. 32425 succumbed to cracked frames and together with 32422

was withdrawn in September 1956. This left just one survivor, 32424 Beachy Head, which was employed on Bournemouth services until it too was stood down in February 1957. However it was steamed in June that year but blew out a cylinder cover, fortunately one was available from 32425 and it was soon repaired, and it was then employed on fish specials and parcels workings until the end of the year.

At this point 32424 was requested for the 'Sussex Coast Ltd' tour planned for April 1958 for which it was specially cleaned and prepared. It made its final journey to Eastleigh on April 24 under its own steam and was subsequently broken up, with its nameplate being removed and later presented to the Mayor of Eastbourne.

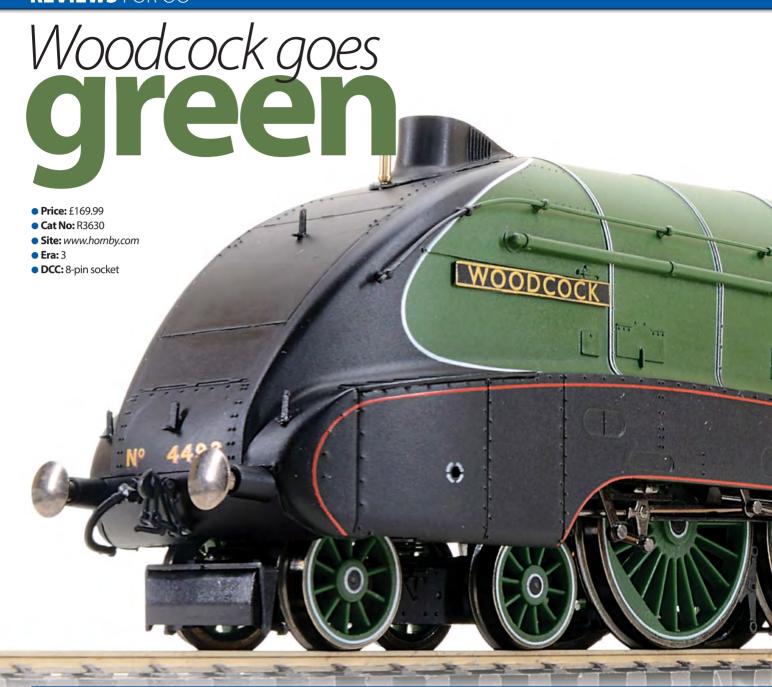
And there the story of the 'Hs' should have ended except for an unusual initiative which stems from members of the Bluebell Railway. In 2000, conscious that the 'H' was a fine example of a lost period of British engineering, a plan was announced to construct a replica of 32424 Beachy Head based around a former Great Northern 'Atlantic' boiler (itself a miraculous discovery) and a surviving tender frame and wheels. Substantial progress has been made on this project, to the extent that work to rebuild the boiler is advanced and the locomotive has frames and wheels, as well as a host of other fittings. Construction is being undertaken in a specially-commissioned building at Sheffield Park on the Bluebell Railway.

With the prospect of one of these engines being seen in steam for the first time in more than 60 years and a major new model now released, interest in the 'southern' version of the 'Large Atlantic' is sure to reach an all-time high, hopefully spurring on many more layouts set in the interesting period during which these locomotives reigned supreme.

The Class 59 is in the Hornby portfolio for the beginning of a third life and its second with Hornby this time in the RailRoad range. The former Lima model, which now features an upgraded mechanism, 8-pin DCC decoder socket and small tension lock couplings, has been turned out as Yeoman's 59004 Paul A Hammond. 59004 carried this

livery from the early 2000s until repaint in Aggregate Industries colours in 2016, though it lost its Yeoman branding around 2014.

The model is still as it was in previous iterations while Hornby has correctly selected the Class 59/0 bodyshell for 59004 with the telltale sign being the central light cluster. Decoration is to a high standard, although subtly reduced to suit the price point of a RailRoad product. The full accessory pack including replacement bufferbeam valances and brake pipes is also still included with the Class 59. With its sub-£85 price point,

smooth running motor and imposing size, 59004 is a great addition to the RailRoad range and it is encouraging to see that Hornby has also released matching Yeoman liveried PTA bogie stone wagons (Cat No. R6887) in the range at the same time. (MW)

delivered in LNER apple green. Hornby has done an outstanding job of replicating the intricate lined green livery on 4493 from the base colour through to the white-black-white lining on the streamlined casing and tender and red lining to the valances and tender chassis. Even the wheels are fully lined as per the prototype.

As usual, the lettering and numbers are first rate - in fact the only way you could improve upon the factory applied finish would be a set of etched brass nameplates



to replace the supplied versions. In terms of the details, Woodcock is moulded with valances, a single chimney and a corridor tender. The front bufferbeam is fully detailed from the factory, plus there are

sprung buffers front and rear. The accessory pack contains a set of flanged wheels for the trailing truck together with a pair of cylinder drain cock mouldings and a dummy buckeye coupling for the tender.

On the track our sample was nothing short of superb. It ran smoothly and quietly throughout the speed range straight from the box and offers ample haulage capacity to handle an eight coach train with ease. It is also equipped with an 8-pin DCC decoder socket and space for a 28mm round speaker in the tender.

For the 1930s LNER modeller this new model of 4493 Woodcock is a must-have addition. It will stand out from the crowd with its LNER apple green paint finish for all the right reasons. (MW)

Bachmann releases

'00' gauge Mk 1 Carflat



N 1966 British Rail attempted to merge the age of the private car with the railway by offering Motorail services across the country which transported the owners and their cars by rail from major cities to outlying locations using Carflat wagons. The flat wagons would be marshalled with a rake of locomotive hauled carriages and included routes from London to Scotland, Cornwall, Wales and others.

The first Carflat vehicles were introduced in the 1950s using ex-LMS 57ft carriage underframes, as modelled by Oxford Diecast (HM122), but now Bachmann has introduced its model of the 63ft long BR Mk 1 derived vehicles – the Carflat A. As well as being used

for Motorail traffic they were regularly used for the transport of new cars, lorries and vans in bulk flows, the locations including the Ford plant at Dagenham, though more commonly these were finished in BR bauxite rather than the BR blue shown by our review sample.

Bachmann's Mk 1 based Carflats were introduced in the mid 1960s and rode on either B1 (as modelled here) or B4 bogies. Each wagon would normally convey four vehicles and they could be found working along the length of the Eastern Region corridor as well as the Western Region main line into Cornwall. The model is equipped with small tension lock couplings in self-centring sprung NEM pockets, gangway rubbing plates, turned metal wheels and a fully detailed underframe.





As per the prototype, the wagon body is a simple design consisting of a solebar supporting side rails and ends. All of this is neatly moulded in plastic and the side rails have a degree of flexibility to them while also retaining their shape. A planked floor completes the upper areas of the wagon alongside a Motorail branded side panel

achieved to a high standard, just as we would expect from a Bachmann product, with fine printing of the data panels, vehicle number, builders plate, Motorail logos and end details. Even the speed restriction of 90mph is correct for the B1 pattern bogies.

This is another superbly produced addition

be perfectly at home at the tail of a rake of BR blue and grey Mk 1 stock in short rakes or operating in a block formation conveying new cars. Plus, if you decide to add a load of vehicles, Bachmann includes wheel chocks in the detailing pack to add that next level of detail. Excellent all round. (MW)



HE Class 44s were the pioneers of the successful 'Peak' series 1-Co-Co-1 diesel electrics. The first entered traffic in April 1959 with the fleet of 10 in service by February 1960. Initially they were used for passenger traffic on the West Coast Main Line working out of Camden depot, but following the arrival of the production machines this Pilot Scheme design was relegated to freight work.

From the early 1960s the class of 10 was concentrated on Toton depot in Nottinghamshire and they remained allocated there until withdrawal which took place between 1976 and 1980. Two have been preserved.

This latest issue from Bachmann takes advantage of the latest generation chassis for the 'Peaks' including a 21-pin decoder socket, directional lighting and space for a 40mm x 20mm speaker below the roof fan. It models 44006 *Whernside* in its final condition carrying BR blue with yellow bonnet fronts and a weathered finish.

Included with the Class 44 is a full detailing pack for the bufferbeam as well as a collection of open and closed route indicator discs for optional fitting after purchase – all are weathered to match the appearance of the locomotive

too. The Whernside name is printed onto the locomotive, but etched metal 'plates are also included to place over the top to replicate the real locomotive more closely.

With the popularity of the BR blue era this new version of the Class 44 is well timed by Bachmann and is sure to be a popular choice for those modelling Midland territory in the 1970s. With its strong chassis and smooth control it is ideal for long heavy freights, just like the real thing. (MW)

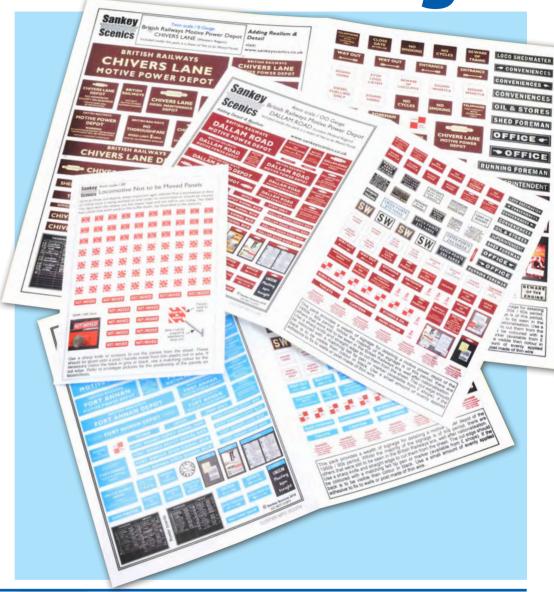

Available in six BR regional colours, each pack contains a wide selection of signage representing the enamelled style reminiscent of the 1950s and 1960s with exterior depot building signs, signalbox nameboards, office, stores and convenience signs, together with clock faces, poster boards, chalk boards and notice boards too. Some pre-nationalisation signage is also included, along with instructional warnings such as Stop Look Listen and Sound Horn. Closer inspection reveals a few subtle differences between some packs – the BR Southern Region pack, for example, including conductor rail specific Danger Electric Rail signage. Suitable for use with steam and/or diesel installations of the period, the signs are printed on photographic card and each pack can be customised with your choice of depot name - prototype or fictional. Perfect for adding that finishing touch to a depot scene. (MC)

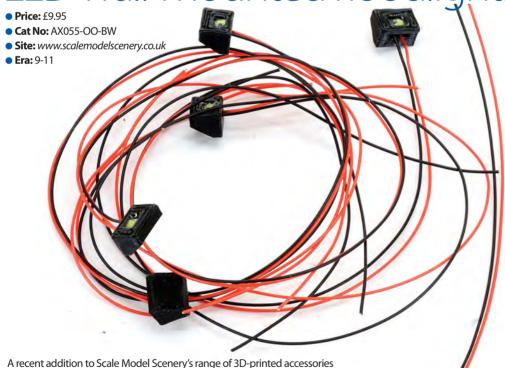

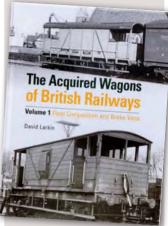

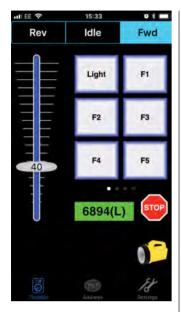
HIS LATEST RELEASE from Crecy is the first volume in a new series on British Railways wagons from David Larkin.

The Acquired Wagons of British Railways Volume 1 – Fleet Composition and Brake Vans sets the scene of the wagon fleet immediately following nationalisation in 1948 as British Railways inherited a proliferation of private-owner vehicles. The introduction looks to the general composition of this huge fleet of vehicles and the planned renumbering scheme for the various wagon types, as well as application of BR standard colours to differentiate between their braking characteristics and intended roles.

Demonstrating their pivotal role within a goods train formation, brake vans are the first of the fleet to be showcased, with a full explanation of their use and differences between types, as well as on restrictions to their use, particularly examples without lookout duckets. From a modelling perspective, this is ideal for researching livery variations, numbering differences and placement of lettering, as well as weathering on the prototypes, which rarely received anything more than a wipe over the number. Prodigy expands



HE CAPABILITIES of digital control continue to expand and this new gadget for the Gaugemaster
Prodigy Advance system integrates the current generation of smartphones into its already well established operating system.

The Prodigy Advance has been Hornby Magazine's go-to system for layout operation for several years using its own dedicated handsets, extension plates and cables. This new device - Prodigy WiFi – allows users to operate their layout via Android and Apple phones and tablets using readily available applications. You will need the Prodigy Advance system to connect the Wifi link to a layout and Android users will need JMRI Engine Driver while Apple users will need WiThrottle to link with Prodigy WiFi. Both are free to download with options to upgrade them for greater operational potential.

Prodigy Wifi is a small 65mm x 65mm x 23mm electronic component and it comes with a cable to connect it to a Prodigy base station as well as screws to fix the device onto a baseboard or control desk. It is finished in a similar style of casing to other equipment in the range, but importantly it doesn't require an internet connection to work. Instead Prodigy WiFi is a network which sends out a wireless internet signal that phones and tablets can connect to in the same way as you would to a home broadband router. The connection process takes seconds as, because it doesn't connect to the internet,



there is no security password required to make the connection.

Once connected you get a consistent link between your phone and the Prodigy base station via the WiFi link. A red light indicates that the device is active and response from the WiThrottle app that we piloted on both an

Apple iPhone and iPad was instant.
The WiThrottle applied uick to

The WiThrottle app is quick to navigate and controls locomotive speed, sound and light functions as well as being able to set up consists. It can't read or write CVs, so you will need to retain a Prodigy handset for that purpose. The full version of the app also

includes the ability to change points as well as a multiple control screen for large screen tablets. The screens can also be configured with the locomotive control bar on the left or right to suit operator preference.

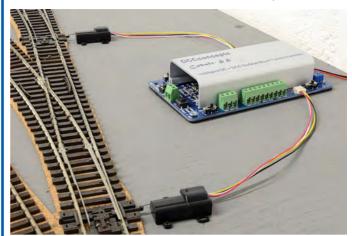

DCC Concepts has earned an excellent reputation for its Cobalt point motors and it is now offering one of the smallest surface mounted motors in its Cobalt SS series. They are available in two, six and 12 packs as well as additional packs with wiring for crossovers.

For review we were able to install and test a two pack of Cobalt SS. Included is a pair of stepper motor drive units, each measuring just 26mm x 20mm, a control board (110mm x 60mm), comprehensive instructions, mounting screws and a range of links to suit different track types and heights.

Installation is a five-step process. First space needs to be allocated for the motor alongside the track (making these ideal for storage yards), next a link needs to be selected to correctly align the motor with the point. Thirdly, the motor needs to be hooked onto the end of the point tie bar and then its wiring harness needs to be plugged into the supplied control board. The control board can then be connected to an analogue or digital power supply between 12 and 23 volts allowing the final step of adjustment and set up to take place.

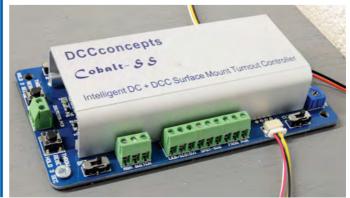
The setup process is aided

by the comprehensive control board supplied with the motors. This allows the length of throw to be adjusted to suit different scales of track as well as different types using nothing more than a small crosshead screwdriver. Plus, if you get in a mess you can always reset everything back to the factory settings using a specially provided button.

Other handy features of the control board include a switch to change the direction of operation, a slide switch to change between programming and operating modes and outputs to connect to manual switches, LEDS for feedback and a frog polarity switch.

Our installation and setup took less than 20 minutes for our first go - we could do it quicker now having experienced the steps required and with the motors addressed and set up for the correct throw they have been changing points reliably in the storage yard on Topley Dale.

Cobalt SS is an impressive piece of kit, but it is the control board which makes it even better This has clearly been thought through from the end user's point of view as everything is simple to adjust and set up at the flick of a switch. A great follow up in the Cobalt series. (MW)

APOL gave Hornby Magazine an early chance to look over its new 'OO' gauge model of the 'Turbot' spoil wagon when this selection of 'Dutch' and EWS liveried pre-production samples touched down in our office during August.

The 'Turbot' spoil wagons, TOPS code YCV, were introduced in 1982 with almost 1,000 being built at Shildon, Swindon and Doncaster. The last were built in 1988. The fleet used the underframes of former BR

Bogie Bolster E wagons which had been found to be too short for their intended steel traffic. The 'Turbots' could be found across the BR system on spoil trains, but due to their dropside doors sustaining repeated damage they were progressively withdrawn across the late 1990s and early 2000s.

Dapol's model of these 35ft long 34ton low-sided open wagons goes to great lengths to model these vehicles in full detail. Two liveries are available, BR 'Dutch' grey and yellow and later EWS

maroon and gold, with three running numbers being offered on each initially.

Decoration of both our samples was excellent in all respects with impressive and fine data panels, TOPS codes, 'Turbot' names and more. The separately fitted handrails on each end are also picked out in white together with the handbrake handles.

The body features removable dropside doors allowing these models to be posed in a yard as well as forming part of a spoil train formation. The mouldings are excellent

the gap this can be done by trimming the coupling pocket and coupling tail to suit. With its exacting standard of detail above and below the solebar, excellent decoration and bufferbeam details, the new 'Turbot' by Dapol is sure to be another sought after engineering wagon for anyone with a layout set between 1982 and 2005. It can be used without the large 125ml plastic bottle colour cup to support small paint volumes up to 2ml, but we found the large colour cup very useful for spraying large areas of track with weathering colours during the early stages of layout construction.

The 0.5mm nozzle will also allow fine paint patterns to be achieved using the built in 2ml paint cup and



With the round spray cap fitted it will range between 3mm and 50mm spray width while the fan design sprays between 25mm and 63mm – plenty of options.

Like all airbrushes, a rigorous cleaning cycle is needed to ensure it remains in perfect operating condition and we found that the large colour cup eased this process too as it could be removed airbrush using water alone.

If you have been looking for a means of painting large areas without the need to resort to aerosol cans (and repeated paint mixing), the Sparmax GP-850 is a solid choice. It comes with a five-year warranty and is a strong all round design for a range of weathering and painting jobs for layouts and rolling stock. (MW)

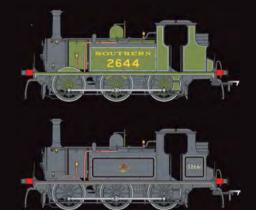

Intercity EXPRESS SOUND



MIKE WILD examines the potential for digital sound in Hornby's 'OO' gauge model of the high profile Class 800 bi-mode unit using a new ESU sound decoder from DC Kits and Legomanbiffo.

The Class 800s operated by GWR are the first of a new generation of bi-mode trains.

They can operate from 25kV AC overhead power supplies as well as from onboard diesel engines. Switching between modes can be done on the move or during station stops as the pantographs can be raised and lowered from the cab. One of the current changeover

points between electric and diesel power is Didcot Parkway where stopping trains carry out the procedure at the station whereas through trains pass the platforms on diesel and change over to the east of the station. The recordings for the new Class 800 sound

decoder have been produced with the support of Hitachi allowing Legomanbiffo's recordings to replicate the real trains in full. Moreover, the decoder allows modellers to replicate both electric and diesel sound operation. Just like the real thing this changeover can be made on the move or while stationary using F1 for electric and the addition of F8 to start up the diesel engines.

Beyond this Legomanbiffo has included a range of regularly used sounds from the Class 800 such as playable horns, door

opening and closing sounds and even configurable on train announcements.

We installed the new decoder, plus a DCC Concepts 8-pin decoder in the trailer car, to take this test train liveried sample into the digital age. It transforms the unit's operation

and includes control of the directional lighting as well as the realistic sounds.

Think you haven't got space for an 'O' gauge layout? **PETER PRICE** thought so too but proved himself wrong in this slice of steam era Glasgow powered by an NCB Power Cab and featuring a full fleet of digital sound locomotives.

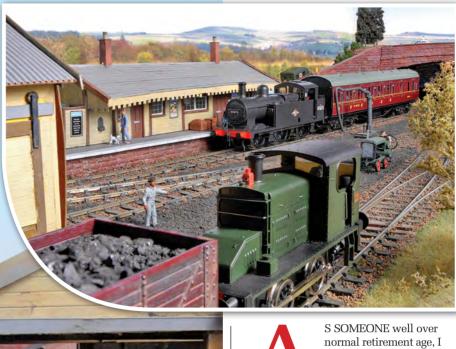

am somewhat bemused at the idea of writing about my first ever personal layout. At this stage of my life, I certainly did not expect to be learning new skills, building a layout and then exhibiting it at local shows. Proving that you can teach an old dog new tricks, the exercise has provided an immense amount of fun and satisfaction.

I have been a member of East Kilbride Model Railway Club for more than 20 years and have contributed, in a small way, to the development of the club's excellent exhibition layouts including the highly popular Crawford Bridge and Gala Water. During this time, I never considered the idea of building a personal layout, being perfectly content to run my collection of 'OO' and 'N' gauge stock on the club layouts and make it available when the club was invited to exhibitions.

In recent years, however, my ideas started to change when a couple of the club members became involved with 'O' gauge. When I saw their locomotives for the first time, I was so impressed. The solid look and feel of them, the very visible detail, and the imposing size made me realise that this was the direction I had to follow. My enthusiasm seemed to be infectious, with the club members making a decision to plan and build an 'O' gauge exhibition layout.

This provided me with the excuse, if indeed an excuse was needed, to acquire my first 'O' gauge locomotive. A second-hand 'J50' on sale at a small 'O' gauge show caught my eye. It was described as 'non running', but a fellow club member was convinced that it only needed a couple of wires resoldered and a good clean. It turned out to be a good investment as it now runs perfectly.

This was soon followed by a partbuilt Sentinel with which I got willing help to complete. With the purchase of three of the very affordable Ixion locomotives, I realised that I had the basis of a collection, but nowhere to run them, >>>



as the club's 'O' gauge project would take a couple of years to complete.

OUTSIDE HELP

In earlier years, I had often thought about building a small 'N' or 'OO' home layout, but there was simply not enough space in the house. The idea of an 'O' gauge layout seemed a definite non-starter. But where there is a will, there is a way. My attention turned to the garden, where with some rearrangement, I could make room for a new shed with a maximum size of 10ft x 6ft, which would provide enough space for at least a test track.

The shed was purchased and erected and then I set about lining and insulating it. With the provision of power and light, I now had a warm, dry but not very spacious railway room. It was at this time that Bill Campbell, a fellow club member, suggested that, instead of having just a test track, he could design a small working layout using Templot. The resulting plan provided a scenic area of just under 6ft and a 4ft sector plate. Incredibly, the scenic area incorporated a small station, a goods shed and an engine shed - more than enough to provide operational interest. The design allows for a two-coach train, which can be run round using the sector plate as one end of the loop.

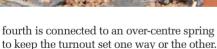
The baseboards were constructed using the traditional method of plywood tops on softwood frames. The board with the sector plate had to be tapered to allow for the opening of the shed door.

The Templot design was printed out and pasted on to the baseboards for tracklaying. Due to the space limitations, commercially built pointwork was not feasible. The turnouts had to be handbuilt from components and were constructed directly on to the baseboards using ply timbering, Exactoscale chairs and C&L rail. The plain track is also from C&L. This was my first experience of building turnouts and I was grateful for the help and guidance provided by the more skilful members, who supervised the building of the first one, giving me the confidence to complete the others myself. Once completed, the trackwork was ballasted using 4mm scale materials from Green Scene, and the grass embankments were 'seeded' with static grass.

The turnouts are switched using pushpull rods under the baseboard which operate four-arm servo horns - one arm for the rod, one for the operating wire which runs through the baseboard to the turnout switch rails, one for the microswitch which changes the polarity of the 'Vee', and the

SCOTTISH SETTING

Peterton is set just to the north of Glasgow in the area of my childhood. Then, it was a thriving coal mining region, with numerous collieries and iron and steel works. I remember well, not just the heavy coal trains on the BR lines, but also the numerous little private owner tank locomotives running on the colliery and works systems. With Peterton, I have tried to represent a short branch line which would connect with the main Glasgow to Edinburgh line, and also rekindle memories of the private owner traffic and locomotives.

The buildings have a Caledonian Railway influence. The station, goods shed and engine shed were built in embossed plastic sheet with much help

from Jimmy Anderson, a founder member of the East Kilbride club, who sadly recently passed away. The approach road to the station crosses the line on a stone overbridge that creates the scenic break. Completing the picture is a commercially produced backscene.

Despite its compact size, Peterton allows for a considerable amount of movement, with BR trains coming in and out of the station, and the goods shed and sidings being used by both BR and the private owners. The limited facilities of the engine shed and coaling stage are also shared by the various operators. The rolling stock is fitted with Dingham couplers that provide automatic coupling and easier uncoupling compared with three link couplings and a 'shunter's pole'.

The layout is powered by Digital Command Control (DCC). I opted for the

NCE Power Cab system for its simplicity and ease of use. In particular, I find that the thumbwheel throttle is very comfortable to use, smooth and responsive. The DCC wiring is the only wiring on the layout, with the lights at the station also being powered from the DCC bus. So, if the lights go out, I know I have a problem.

The locomotives were originally fitted with Gaugemaster decoders, but I am now systematically changing them to sound decoders. I have opted for the Zimo MX645R chips which are more usually fitted to 'OO' gauge locomotives, but as my 'O' gauge locomotives are never under load, the current draw is well within the 2 Amp limit of the smaller decoders. The compact size of the 645s also makes them much easier to fit into the small tank locomotives. Speakers are mounted either between the frames or in the cabs.)

ROLLING STOCK

My rolling stock is a mix of kit-built items purchased second hand, some needing remedial work, and Slater's kits which I have built. I found the kit building experience very satisfying as I hadn't built a plastic kit since I was a young teenager with Airfix kits. Since completion of the layout, I have added to my fleet a Caledonian Railway '3F' 0-6-0T, a Dapol 'Jinty' 0-6-0T, and what is now my largest locomotive, a Bachmann BR '4MT' 2-6-4T.

The building of Peterton has certainly been a learning curve for me, but one which has provided me with immense satisfaction. Unfortunately, I am no longer fit enough to travel to exhibitions far afield. However, with the baseboards compact and light enough to transport in the car, I have been able to exhibit Peterton at local shows. So far, it has been to the 'O' gauge show at Pollokshaws in Glasgow, and an 'O' gauge show in Troon.

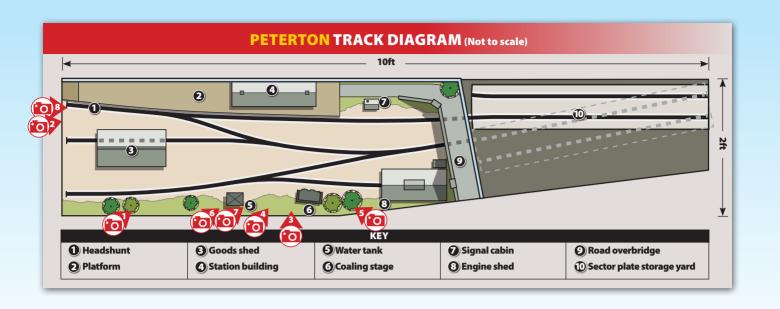
I have been very grateful for the encouraging comments, with many viewers expressing surprise that such a workable layout could be created in such a small space. I can only hope that Peterton may encourage more people, for whom space may be a problem, to attempt a compact layout and enjoy the current resurgence of 'O' gauge modelling.

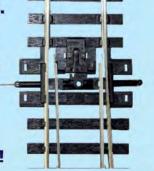

Although road transport has dominated land travel for decades there have been many occasions when railways have offered a helping hand to the motor car, as EVAN GREEN-HUGHES discovered. Cally Signature of the control of the contro

T THE END OF THE 19^{th} century when the first primitive motor vehicles tentatively chugged and popped their way along the country's roads, Britain already had a well-developed and sophisticated railway system. Our highways though were not so advanced. In cities and towns road surfaces were cobbled while in the country they could be anything from smooth tarmac to unmade dusty earth. Travel was slow, not only because cars themselves had a low top speed but also because main roads went through every village and town and suffered delays as a result.

By the dawn of the motor age railways had already been offering a form of transport service for road vehicles for some time. Horse-drawn carriages were often delivered from their place of manufacture to the customer by rail, as such journeys could be accomplished in a fraction of the time that would have been needed had horses been used. Surprisingly tramcars were also a considerable source of business, with double-deckers being delivered in two parts, top and bottom, and then offloaded and assembled in the railway yard before being drawn on by horses to the local tramway. Not so well known was the carriage of fire engines by rail. On one occasion when fire broke out at Windsor Castle and reinforcements were required from London it was quicker to send them on flat wagons than to try to make the journey by road.

HOLIDAY TRAFFIC

The railways also had a lucrative business moving the carriages of the rich from London to Scotland during the holiday season, and it was this business which provided much of the early car-carrying trade. Initially these primitive motors were conveyed on flat wagons attached to the rear of express trains but damage caused by flying sparks and other debris soon led to the introduction of dedicated wagons – amongst the most famous the Covered Carriage Truck (CCT).

These vehicles were essentially four-wheel covered goods vans but equipped with full size end doors which enabled vehicles to be loaded from a suitable dock, remaining protected throughout their journey. Later versions of the CCT could have six or even eight wheels, although the most common design was a long-wheelbase four-wheeler which proved so useful that production continued right into British Railways days with numerous design changes along the way from individual railway companies. Similar vehicles were used to deliver new cars, which in Victorian times were still being made in penny numbers.





By 1913 there were no fewer than 200 different manufacturers of motor vehicles in the country, many of which were descended from bicycle makers, so deliveries of new cars were easily dealt with on a case-by-case basis. All this changed in 1913 when Henry Ford opened his new production plant in Manchester and at the same time increased production of cars in the country by 50%. Parts for these were imported via the Manchester Ship Canal directly from the USA and complete trainloads of cars were then dispatched to terminals all over the country, with most of these being accommodated on flat wagons.

In the following year the outbreak of the First World War saw a massive increase in vehicle production as many of the country's engineering works were turned over to the manufacture of munitions and vehicles. Railways played their part in moving these around but during this period there were

very few cars built. However, following the conflict, many of those who returned had become familiar with motor vehicle technology, and with a ready supply of war surplus available the scene was set for a massive expansion in motor vehicle use.

DRIVING FORCE

One of the companies that seized on this expansion was Ford and within a short time plans were being drawn up for a huge new production facility at Dagenham in Essex. This location was chosen as it was near land which was suitable for the development of a deep water port but also because the site was large enough to provide for a complex railway system to be built to serve it. Completed in 1931, the facility built cars and light trucks and from the outset despatched trainloads of vehicles away each day. The site also boasted some of the earliest diesel shunters,

which dated from the time of opening.

Austin cars meanwhile had set up its equivalent at Longbridge in Birmingham with its site chosen because it could be served by either the Great Western (GWR) or the London Midland & Scottish Railway (LMS). Again an extensive internal system was provided, although this time initially worked by horse. Trainloads of cars were sent to distribution points scattered all over the country from here.

RAILWAY REALISM

coaches converted into car transporters by the simple expedient of removing their bodies and fitting a planked deck with low handrails and tie-down points.

The inter-war years saw an expansion in the business of moving cars long distances to enable their owners to use them when they went on holiday. Despite improvements in the road system travel, for instance, from London to Scotland was still a long drawn-out affair and this led companies such as the London and North Eastern Railway (LNER) to construct special bogie carcarrying vehicles which could be run at express speeds and which allowed holidaymakers to take their cars with them. These sophisticated vehicles were fully covered and secure from the elements.

The Second World War halted progress in the car industry for some years but there was a massive expansion in the years following the conflict. Plants such as Dagenham and Longbridge massively ramped up production and they were joined by new entrants such as Linwood in Scotland, a site set up by the Rootes Group to produce Hillman Imps, Hillman Avengers and Sunbeams, and Bathgate which made light trucks. These new plants led to a large number of car trains being introduced between Scotland and England.

MASS TRANSIT

In September 1964 due to the sheer number of vehicles requiring transport British Rail brought into service its first double-deck car-carrying wagon, designed in conjunction with Ford. This was the Cartic 4, which was actually four lightweight vehicles, semi-permanently coupled in a set, which could carry 30-40 cars and which were so successful in reducing costs that car traffic doubled within 12 months.

While all this was going on British Rail also had its Motorail service which continued to provide accommodation for cars in specially adapted wagons at the rear of long distance service trains. A network was built up which covered destinations in Scotland, Wales, the West Country and

London with vehicles being accommodated mainly on wagons built once again from the frames of redundant coaches and now known as 'Carflats' with the 'Cartic 4s' being used occasionally. Unfortunately for this service new motorways were making long distance driving easier while cars were becoming ever faster and more reliable, resulting in a steady decline and eventual closure of the service.

With the railways now being asked to carry ever more vehicles, particularly as trade became more global and more were exported and imported, considerable investment was made in new wagons. The PJA Autic Six was a two-wagon set with two decks which also had a depressed centre allowing vehicles of a greater height to be carried while Procor produced the PQA which was a semi-permanent pairing of two wagons which had the benefit of a top deck which could be lowered, thus allowing loading and unloading without

requiring any special two-tier ramps.

The open nature of many of the wagons employed meant that there were many cases where vehicles were damaged during transit, in some cases deliberately

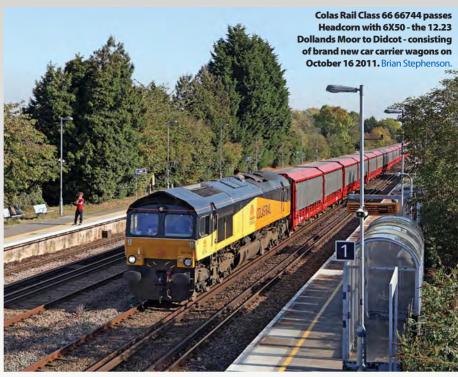


by thieves who would target them while trains were recessed in sidings or in loops. Distributor MAT was one of the first to have wagons fitted with mesh side screens but it was found that some debris still found its way onto the cars and so later plastic side sheeting and pneumatically raised roof panels were added. British Leyland continued to use conventional bogie vans with end loading doors for its MG sports cars built in Abingdon, fearing damage to the fragile soft tops.

BIG BUSINESS

Today hundreds of thousands of cars are carried by rail each year, with the majority being conveyed in specially-built fully-enclosed transporters. Some car plants or import terminals can dispatch as many as two or three trains in a day; however as might be expected many new vehicles now make their first journey on a road transporter, rather than by rail.

We shouldn't forget too that although Great Western Trains' Motorail post-privatisation experiment using converted Mk 1 coaches proved unsuccessful, there is one railway in Britain which conveys many thousands of cars, coaches and lorries and their passengers every year – the Channel Tunnel. The vehicles are a massive leap in size and capability compared with anything else and would be challenging to



model – but nonetheless, they prove that there are some routes where the 'rolling highway' can be highly successful.

Although the days when the country gentry would take their shooting brake along in a covered van on the rear of an Anglo-Scottish express are over car production is rising year on year. Cars travelling by rail is one traffic that seems to have a bright future ahead of it.



STATT PROJECTS

GASTURBINE

The Great Electric Train Show is just a few weeks away and the fleet for Grosvenor Square is being expanded with new locomotives including gas turbine prototype 18000.

MIKE WILD explains how this sidelined model has been brought back into traffic.

HE BROWN-BOVERI GAS
turbine is unique. It sits
on two A1A bogies and
developed 2,500hp
powered by a gas turbine made
by the Swiss manufacturer.
Construction was carried out
by Brown Boveri in Switzerland
following authorisation by the GWR
in 1940, although it took until 1949
for the locomotive to be completed.
It operated exclusively on the
Western Region until December
1960, and it remains in preservation
at Didcot Railway Centre.

This model of 18000 was built in 2010 for a feature in HM41. It uses the Silver Fox Models resin body kit and a Bachmann Class 37 chassis, but rather embarrassingly it has barely turned a wheel since it was completed for that feature. It had no place to run where it fitted in, but the expansion of Grosvenor Square provided a prime opportunity to

investigate bringing the model back into service as well as a handful of other rarely used locomotives.

It was finished in early BR black livery with silver lining, roof and bogies together with large early crests on each side of the body. Normally we focus on the steam to diesel hydraulic transition period on Grosvenor, so we will be stretching history a little to include 18000 sitting alongside the likes of 'Warships' and 'Westerns'. However, we are more than happy to bend history slightly to see this huge locomotive out and running.

Bringing 18000 up to scratch for a return to service has been a simple procedure, even though it has been out of service for so long. The chassis is an early Bachmann Class 37 with an 8-pin Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder socket, so having cleaned the wheels and checked over the internals with

a test run on analogue control it was given a light oiling to make sure everything worked as it should. Having completed this basic maintenance procedure it was fitted with a Hatton's 8-pin harnessed decoder which was then tested on factory address 3 before

Having cleaned the wheels and oiled the mechanism we tested the chassis for 18000 to ensure it worked as we wanted it to after eight years in storage. It was then fitted with a Hatton's 8-pin decoder.

being changed to 1800 to fit in with the rest of the locomotive fleet.

Next on the cards was the addition of glazing for the rear cab and cab door windows which had gone missing during its time in storage. For the cab door windows we used Deluxe Materials Glue 'n' Glaze which is a simple means of adding glazing to small windows. All you have to do is run a bead of glue around the edge of the window frame then, keeping a small amount of glue

flowing, pull the nozzle across the aperture to create a glazing effect. It takes a few hours to cure and go clear, but the results are excellent.

For the main cab windows a replacement set has been ordered from Silver Fox Models, as the Glue 'n' Glaze wouldn't stretch to the size of window required. Once received it will be a two minute job to pop the new glazing in completing its external appearance. 18000 will be one of a handful

of non-sound fitted locomotives running on Grosvenor Square at the Great Electric Train Show. The new depot scene (see pages 58-65) has increased the demands on the previous locomotive fleet so we've also added a Hornby '72XX' 2-8-2T, GWR 'Star' 4-6-0 and 'Large Prairie' to the non-sound roster while new additions to the sound equipped fleet for the show include a Heljan '47XX' 2-8-0 together with a new 'King' and 'Castle' 4-6-0 from the

Hornby range. Other locomotives joining the roster, previously prepared for St Stephen's Road, include a Hornby'42XX'2-8-0T and a Bachmann Collett'2251'0-6-0. There might be more, but we have plenty to keep us busy for the show with final preparations on the original rolling stock fleet for the layout.

18000 will be a great addition and we are looking forward to taking Grosvenor Square out on show again. See you at the show!

In the mid-1920s, with train load sizes increasing to and from the South West, the Great Western Railway was faced with the need for even more powerful locomotives, something that could haul the heavy expresses at an average speed of 60 mph. In response, the Great Western's General Manager, Sir Felix Pole, gave his Chief Mechanical Engineer, Charles Collett, permission to proceed with the design and construction of a 'Super-Castle', the result being the GWR 6000 King class 4-6-0 design which emerged from the Swindon Works in June 1927.
