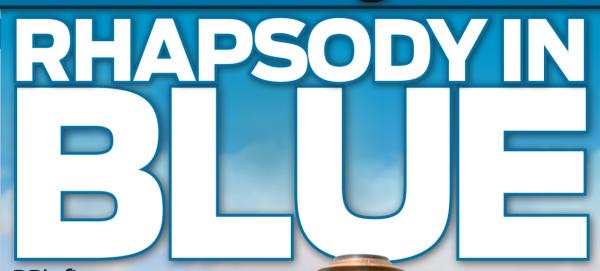

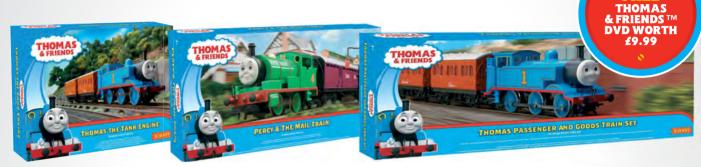

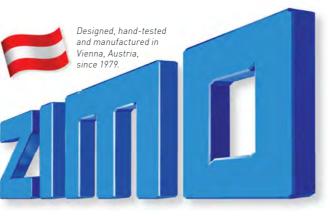

R MODELS IS SETTO officially launch its project to produce a ready-to-run model of English Electric gas turbine prototype GT3 at the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition on November 24/25.

The 'OO' gauge model of GT3 was first proposed in June this year (HM133), but since then project

leader Keith Revell has moved forward to be able to offer DCC ready and potentially a DCC sound equipped version of the unique 4-6-0. The current schedule will see GT3 arrive with customers in December 2019 with prices starting from £185 for a DCC ready model. GT3 was built by English Electric

at Vulcan Foundry in Newton-le-

Willows between 1958 and 1961. It was the third gas turbine prototype following on from the Western Region operated 18000 (built by Brown-Boveri in Switzerland) and 18100 (built by Metropolitan Vickers). GT3 stood out as it used a steam locomotive style 4-6-0 chassis for the locomotive with a tender behind to carry kerosene fuel.

GT3 had a reported maximum speed of 90mph, 2,750hp and 38000lbf of tractive effort. It only operated on British Railways metals until 1962 when it was returned to Vulcan Foundry.

KR Models is currently researching the project to move it forward to tooling and production. This is complicated by

New 2019 products from Train-Tech

Train-Tech launched its new 2019 products on October 13/14 at the Great Electric Train Show in Milton Keynes. Spearheading the new announcements is Smart Screen (Cat No. SD1), a self-contained working animated screen for 'OO', mimicking electronic destination display boards seen on station platforms and on some modern multiple units. Displays can be customised to suit your requirements, with messages also capable of scrolling across the screen too, such as station calling points. Suitable for use with analogue (DC) or digital (DCC) operation, the OLED screen measures 31mm x 9.5mm and has been designed to be platform mounted or fitted within a suitable 'OO' gauge model. It can display different



messages according to the direction of travel, using an in-built digital decoder and can also be used in conjunction with the manufacturer's Track Sensor system. Also launched during the weekend

is Train-Tech's new Sound Track sound recorder. This hand-held device has been designed so that you can record your own audio and play it back on the layout. It features four different sound tracks, which can be played back instantly by pressing one of the four buttons on the device, or it can be triggered using a digital command or in conjunction with Train-Tech's Track Sensor system. The portable sound recorder features an in-built microphone, loudspeaker, volume control, storage for four audio files up to 35 seconds each, a lock feature and more. Measuring 111mm x 57mm x 30mm, it can be powered from DC or DCC inputs, as well as a 9volt internal battery. Prices for the Smart Screen are set at £50, with a twin-pack (SD2) also available, priced £90. Compatible 3D-printed screen enclosures are priced at £10. The Sound Track sound recorder is priced at £69.

Hornby has received the latest version of its sought after Peckett 'W4' 0-4-0ST for 'OO' gauge. Modelling works number 560 of 1893, the model is delivered in Peckett works livery of leaf green with black lining and works lettering along the running plate. The locomotive was built for the United Alkali Co of St Helens in Lancashire. This new issue of the Peckett 'W4' has the same highly detailed body as the original batch launched in 2016 (HM115), small tension lock couplings in NEM pockets, and space for a Hornby four-pin decoder.

Named train Bulleids for Kernow

Kernow Model Rail Centre is producing a new batch of its 'OO' gauge Bulleid 1-Co-Co-1 diesels, following the sell-out of its previous releases.

Six models are planned, four of which are re-issues but will come with appropriate named train headboards for the first time. The new batch will model 10201 in BR black with early crests and 'Bournemouth Belle' headboard (Cat No. K2701A), 10202 in BR black with early crests and a 'Golden Arrow'

headboard (K2702A), 10203 in BR black with early crests and an 'Atlantic Coast Express' headboard (K2703A) and 10203 in BR green with late crests and a 'Royal Scot' headboard (K2704A).

Headboards will be supplied separately within the packaging, together with limited-edition certificates. Just 150 of each will be produced.

The remaining two locomotives will be standard releases as 10201 in BR green with late crests and grey roof (K2705) and 10202 in

BR green with late crests and grey roof (K2706) – this being the first time these models have appeared in this livery with late crests suitable for use on London Midland Region set layouts.

Prices are £179.99 DCC ready and £309.99 for DCC sound-fitted locomotives, with a discount offered to customers who pay in full immediately. Delivery is anticipated during the first quarter of 2019.

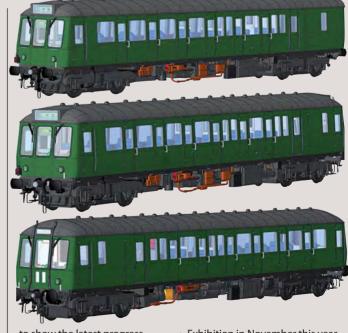

Heljan has shown progress on the CAD drawing works for its series of Pressed Steel and Gloucester Diesel Multiple Units (DMUs) for 'O' gauge covering the Class 117 threecar units as well as the Class 121 and 122 single DMUs. The range also incorporated the Class 149/150 driving trailer cars suitable to run with the Class 121 and 122 respectively. Tooling for the models is now in progress and the Class 117 will be available in early and later formats with different buffers and exhausts while the Class 122 will have options for the front end layout. Heljan has also stated that work on the Class 120 Swindon crosscountry units has been put on hold due to a lack of drawings and reference material. Prices for the models are expected to start from £275 and Heljan is expecting



to show the latest progress on the DMU projects at the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition in November this year.

Accurascale announces PCA CEMENT WAGON

CCURASCALE unveiled plans for its next wagon project at the Great Electric Train Show in Milton Keynes on October 13, the CFMF PCA cement wagon in both 'OO' and 'N' gauge – the latter model in collaboration with Realtrack Models.

The wagons were built in France and entered service with STS Leasing in the early 1980s, finding work initially with Rugby Cement and Blue Circle Cement on their respective traffic flows, while in the mid-1990s they were leased to Castle Cement, where they are still in operation today.

Each 'OO' wagon will feature a wealth of detail and is expected to include over 100 separate parts including ladders, etched walkways, pipe runs, small tension lock couplings in NEM pockets together with thought given to 'EM' and 'P4' conversion and more.

15 triple-packs of individually numbered PCA cement wagons are planned with four packs in STS dark grey (Cat Nos. ACC2020STSA-ACC2023STSD), five packs in

The CIE A/001 diesels were built at Dukinfield Works, Manchester, between 1955 and 1956 with a Crossley two-stroke engine developing 1,200hp. They were used across the country on express and freight traffic, but were rebuilt with General Motors engines in the late 1960s to replace the original power units.

The Irish Traction Group owned preserved example, A39R, was surveyed at the Downpatrick and County Down Railway during 2018 and CAD work has been completed by Irish Railway Models. The specification includes a tungsten metal chassis, fivepole motor with twin flywheels, Kinematic couplings and NEM pockets, metal helical gearbox, realistic maximum speed, DCC ready, factory fitted speakers, directional lighting, marker lights,

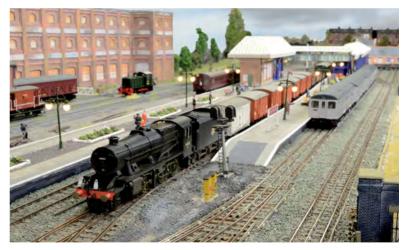

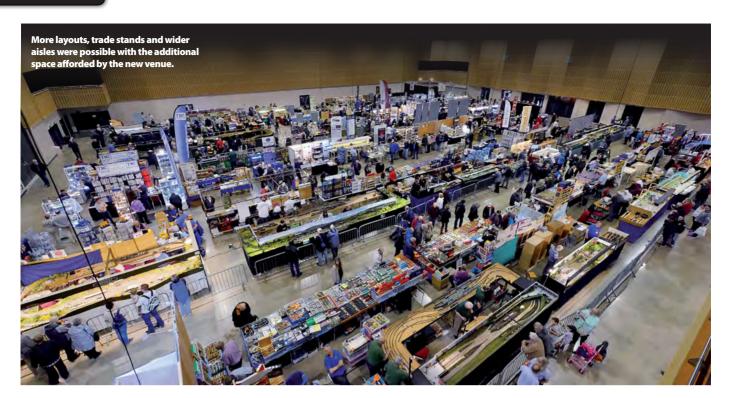

HE WINNERS of the first annual Hornby Magazine Model Railway Awards were revealed at the Great Electric Train Show in Milton Keynes on October 13 following counting of the public votes entered on the Hornby Magazine website during September.

The Model Railway Awards were launched in HM136 offering short lists in seven categories including Manufacturer of the Year, Best Locomotive awards in three scales, innovation and retailer votes.

The winner of the **Best** 'OO' gauge Locomotive was Locomotion Models for its Great Northern Railway Stirling 'single' No. 1 with Hornby's Stanier 'Duchess' 4-6-2 a close second and Kernow Model Rail Centre's Bulleid 1-Co-Co-1 in third. The Best 'O' gauge Locomotive award went to Dapol for the Great Western Railway '57XX' 0-6-0PT followed by the Heljan centre headcode Class 20 in second and the Dapol LMS 'Jinty' 0-6-0T in third place. Best 'N' gauge Locomotive





Model Railway Award 2018 winners

was received by Graham Farish for its English Electric Class 40 diesel in one of the tightest categories. The Dapol Class 68 for 'N' was a very close second followed by an equally close vote for the Revolution Trains Pendolino in third.

The award for **Best 'OO'** gauge Carriage/Wagon with more than 50% of the votes was Rails of Sheffield for its London and North Eastern Railway Dynamometer Car. Second place went to Hornby's Maunsell Restaurant Car with

third place in the vote occupied by Hatton's Beilhack snowplough.

The Best 'O' gauge Carriage/ Wagon was a two-horse race between the Darstaed/Ellis Clark Trains British Railway Mk 1 carriages and Hatton's LMS 'Warwell' bogie wagon – the new Mk 1 carriages taking the award. Third place went to Minerva's GWR Iron Mink. Meanwhile, in 'N' gauge Dapol won the Best 'N' gauge Carriage/Wagon category for the Southern Railway Maunsell four-compartment Brake Third with Revolution Trains coming second with its Class B fuel tanker and Dapol third with its MJA twin-set bogie box wagons.

Train-Tech received the **Innovation of the Year** award for its automatic colour light signals for 'OO' gauge with Gaugemaster's Prodigy Wi-fi in second and Absolute Aspects' banner repeater signal in third.

Large retailer of the Year was received by Rails of Sheffield ahead of Hatton's Model Railways in second and Kernow Model Rail Centre in third while Small Retailer of the Year was won by Cheltenham Model Centre ahead of Osbourne's Models in second and Ten Commandments in third.

The prized **Manufacturer of the Year** vote was awarded to Bachmann Europe with Hornby Hobbies coming a close second and Dapol in third.

Congratulations to the winners all of which were selected by *Hornby Magazine* readers. The *Hornby Magazine* Model Railway Awards will return in 2019 with new categories for public voting.

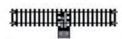

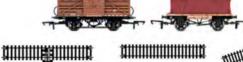

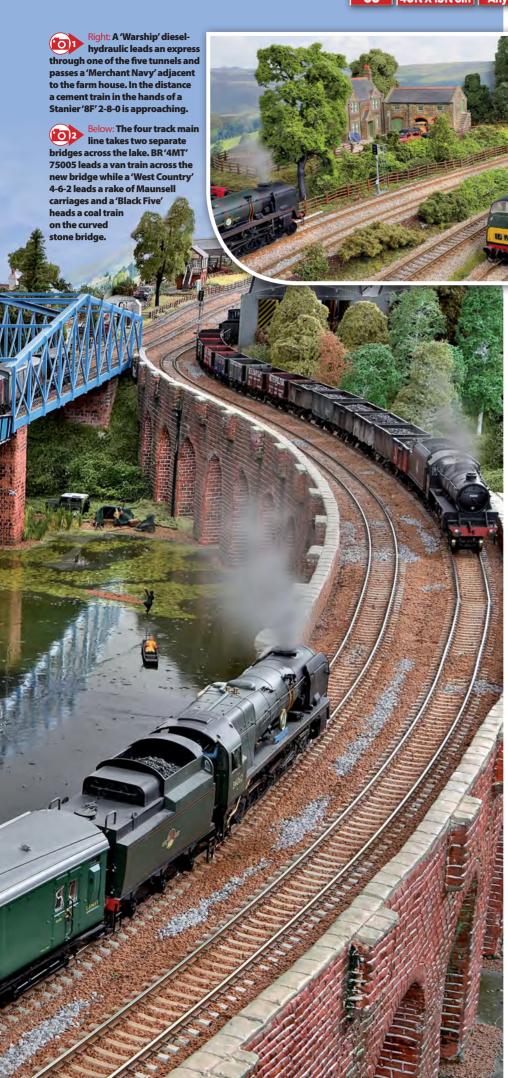

After the children left home, MICHAEL SMITH was able to build the 'OO' gauge layout of his dreams – and, as he explains, it's a sizeable undertaking.

AKESIDE is a fictitious 'OO' gauge layout which occupies the loft of my house. It has a four track main line offering a 103ft long circuit while alongside there are connections to depots, a quarry, a cement works, a mail depot and many other features.

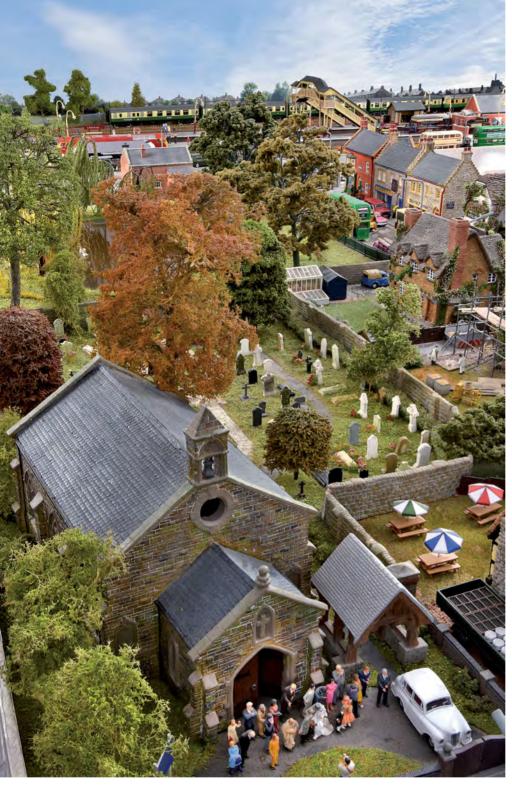
I am a retired Royal Mail station manager and working with the Travelling Post Offices gave me the idea for the layout. Lakeside started in 1998 in my previous property in a 20ft x 15ft shed by a large pond which gave me the name Lakeside. This was the first layout I had really built. Before that I had a small runaround board for my two boys to run a few trains. By the time the first Lakeside was really built the boys had moved on to other things leaving me to carry on.

A house move in 2011 gave me the opportunity to rebuild the layout to the size it is now. I had a rough idea of what I wanted, but nothing was put on paper. A small part of the layout came from the old one. This included the village, part of the turntable, the farm and the Land Rover sales area along with the biker's pub.

The layout has been built using 12mm MDF on 2½ in x 1½ in timber frames. The baseboards are each 8ft x 35in. Track was laid on 2in x 1/8in cork using Woodland Scenics ballast. It took me four years to get most of it done, since then I have been constantly adding to it.

The layout is built with Peco code 100 track and points, of which there are 67. Rails are painted with a brush using Phoenix light rust paint, then the track is ballasted in the usual way using PVA glue and then airbrushed using the same paint. The layout is in a large room built into the bungalow roof and, perhaps not surprisingly, it does not go to exhibitions.

The first trains were running within six months to test the track and I then started on the scenery. I made a couple of changes to the track as I progressed cutting out and putting in new bits. I knew from the start that I wanted an 8ft viaduct going over a lake and I also added a canal setting, a village and a large turntable area. Also, it had to have a Royal Mail depot with Travelling Post Offices as a reminder of my work on the railway. >>>

TOURING LAKESIDE

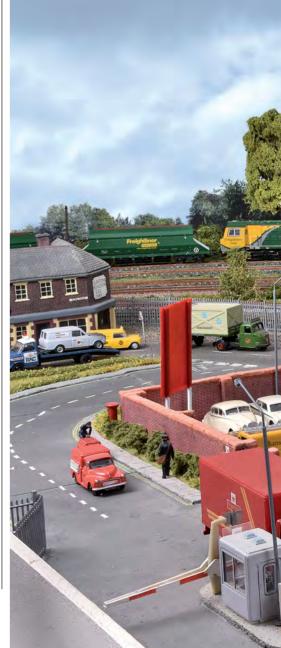
The focus of the layout is Lakeside station. This has four platforms consisting of three through lines and a bay, while there is also an avoiding line on the outer circuit with a set of sidings and loops beyond to store more of the extensive roster available to run on the railway.

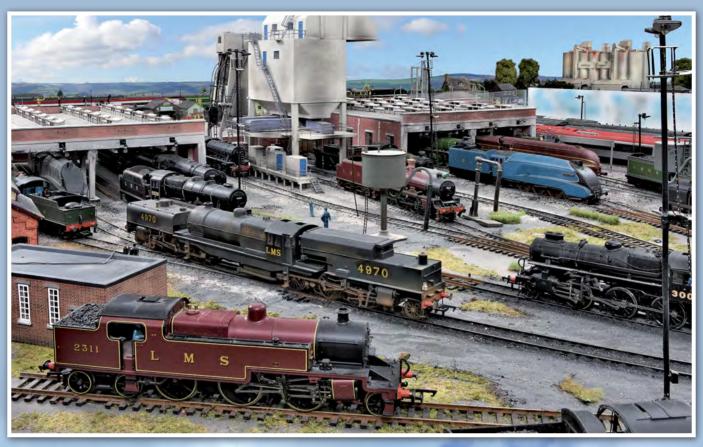
The station platforms are 7ft 3in long, which allows trains of seven coaches and engine to run while providing enough length for all passengers to leave and join the train. The main station building is a Townstreet plaster kit. The platforms are lit by 16V Viessmann lights. Buses at the front of the station are from EFE and most of the figures are Dart Castings, Bachmann and a few Hornby and Preiser.

The total size of the layout is 40ft x 13ft 6in, reducing to 10ft 6in wide at one end.

To put that into context, as well as the main circuits around the edge there is the Royal Mail Depot which measures 8ft x 2ft and is made from three Walthers kits and two Bachmann Scenecraft office buildings. These are joined by Express Models LED lights, Bachmann figures and Oxford Diecast vehicles and Knightwing fencing.

The steam shed and turntable area covers 6ft 3in x 4ft 5in using a Fleischmann turntable from which 25 tracks radiate. Two Bachmann four-road sheds are the main feature of the depot and these are fitted with LEDs from Express Models both inside and outside. There are also 11 small sheds from Scenix around the turntable along with a Bachmann ash pit and coal plant. The boiler house and modern engine shed is another Bachmann Scenecraft product and the







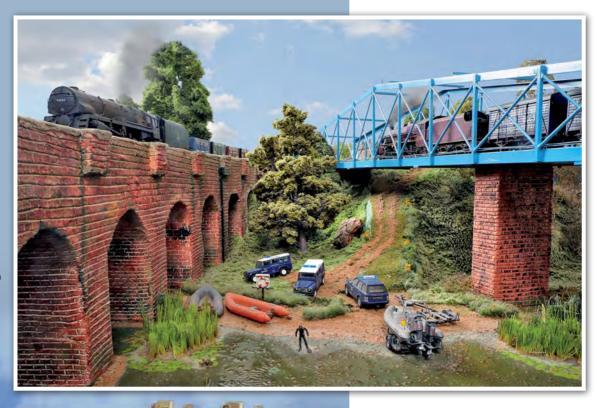


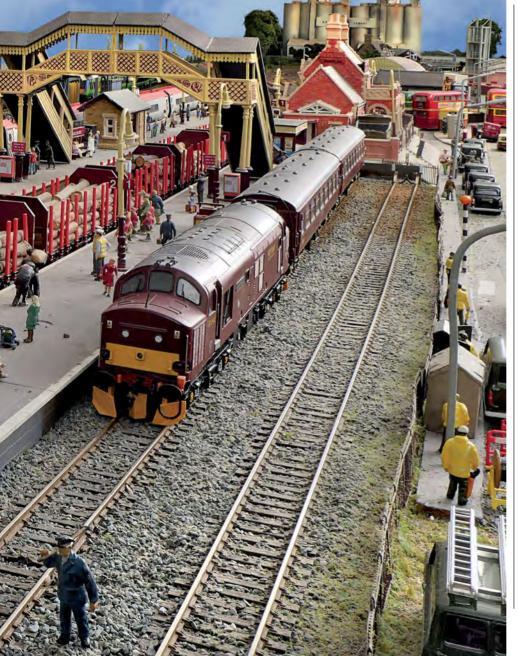


Left: Lakeside occupies a 40ft long loft space which includes plenty of storage for Mick's extensive railway collection.

fuelling point is a Knightwing kit along with Bachmann figures and accessories and a welder from Express Models.

Around the main line circuits there are five tunnels, the longest of which measures 2ft 6in as it passes underneath an airfield and through a wall in the loft. The large bridge which approaches the longest tunnel is made of brass which is spring loaded to allow it to be adjusted up and down by screws to compensate for changes in temperature. The airport above this tunnel plays host to two Sea King helicopters which have been motorised one is controlled by a decoder the other a 12V transformer. There are also two aircraft, buildings and vehicles on site. The next tunnel brings you past a coal yard with coal loading vehicles along with a small Scenix shed with a derelict diesel being worked on. Passing through the next tunnel takes you to a piece of countryside, set out with a flock of sheep, the farmer and his trusty dog from Dart Castings.

Passing through tunnel number four brings you to the new housing estate which is under construction. The houses are from Bachmann and the vehicles an assortment of BT Models, Cararama and Oxford Diecast with accessories from BT Models and Bachmann. The pallet of bricks was made using scale bricks from Juwlee products and stuck on one at a time with PVA glue. The cement bags I made from DAS clay and painted.

The canal was made using white metal lock kits from Langley Models with a plaster base painted with various shades of brown and green followed by many coats of varnish. Trees are from International Models, canal boats are from Langley Models resin kits and small boats are from Noch. Alongside the canal is the entrance to the quarry using a Hornby Skaledale weigh station and vehicles from BT Models along with Bachmann quarry buildings and figures. Next along the line through tunnel number 5 is the Traction Maintenance Depot, made from three Peco building sheds fitted with full lighting. Opposite the traction depot is the farm, a Townstreet plaster kit. Just past this is the signalbox, a Ratio kit fitted with a Springside lever

kit. There are three signal boxes on the layout, another Ratio and a Bachmann all fitted out internally.

Continuing round the layout is a Travelling Post Office pick-up and

drop-off point. This is where the tracks split, two going over the 8ft bridge. The two metal bridges at each end are made of brass and the centre structure which connects the two is made of thin ply with Peco sides. The other two tracks go over the stone viaduct. This was made from plywood and Balsa covered in DAS clay which was then scribed and painted. The water in the lake and the pond in the village are made the same way as the canal was.

Moving on down the line is the overhead bridge which is made again from thin plywood and Peco sides. The pillars which it stands on are plastic heating

pipe which were painted to suit.

The most unusual part of the layout is the Royal Mail depot which you don't see modelled. The size of the village is 6ft 2in x 3ft 4in. I'm proud of the way the village has turned out. Bushes and flowers have been added to set it all off. These came from Tasma products, Busch and Gaugemaster. Street lights at present are bulbs purchased many years ago, but I plan to update these with light emitting diodes.



My favourite parts of the layout are the viaduct and the bridges over the lake but I am also very fond of the canal.

The layout has more than 30 signals from the excellent CR Signals range with four Semaphore signals from Dapol. All signals are controlled using Heathcote Electronics boards except the two-aspects and the semaphore which are manually operated. Points at the moment are manual but I have just started to install Cobalt point motors. The signals and lights on the layout all run from a separate power supply using Gaugemaster transformers.

THE TRAINS

But what about the trains? I have around 240 steam, diesel and electric locomotives with more than 750 wagons and 250

coaches. All locomotives are Digital Command Control fitted - 40 now have sound and 20 have smoke generators. All locomotives have crews. Old diesel models like the early Hornby ones have had light kits fitted using Express Models kits and early Hornby and Heljan diesels have had Ultrascale wheels fitted.

When I am asked the location and era, I have to confess that there isn't one. I like to run various trains of all types and all regions with full length trains. The 40ft length means that long trains can be run without looking out of place. It is all powered by Digital Command Control using Gaugemaster Prodigy wireless.

The enjoyment of the layout is being able to run full length trains – something I feel I have achieved in the fashion I wanted. But work never stops – as I mentioned, I want to upgrade the street lights and add point motors – and I am sure that there will be a lot that keeps me busy over the next few years!

BR BLUE PERIOD



Three blue 'A4s' in 'OO' gauge show the variety of colours which could be seen on the railway in the last two years of the 1940s. lined black. Rakes of coaches were also prepared in new colour schemes as the nationalised railway attempted to find its new identity.

The subject of this article is purely about the blue express passenger

locomotives and the dates for each locomotive appearing in the standard blue and the purple/ ultramarine livery are tabulated.

There were some anomalies in the classes of express locomotives

chosen, as whilst the LNER
'A3s' were included, other'7P'
engines from the Southern, Great
Western and LMS were not and
nor were the Peppercorn'A2s'.

The main blue colour used called BR Standard blue was apparently similar to Caledonian Railway blue, but as we all know that varied considerably as it was often diluted with white and it appears there were variations in colour applied at different works. It also weathered quickly and changed colour and density and colour photographs from the period will illustrate this. The other colour which all regions had applied to some locomotives has been described as a purple shade of ultramarine/ purple and that is also illustrated.

We also have to remember that colour photography from those days was still somewhat in its infancy and that transparencies and negatives have faded in the intermediate years. The appearance of the standard blue on preserved examples running today seems

more vivid - I expect that not only extreme cleanliness plays a part but the fact the locomotives spend far less time in the sunshine than their BR counterparts meaning the effect of weathering, particularly fading caused by sunlight, is far less pronounced.

WESTERN REGION

'King' 4-6-0s - Only the 'Kings' were included in the blue repaint scheme – 6001, 6009, 6025 and 6026 received the experimental ultramarine/purple blue livery in the summer of 1948; the others all received the standard BR blue. The last 'King' to retain the blue was 6025 which finally went into BR green in January 1954.

SOUTHERN REGION

'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s - Only these locomotives from Southern stock were included in the re-paint scheme. One, 35024, received the ultramarine/purple livery but with a difference as horizontal broad red lines were applied.



These were quickly changed for the white-black-white that was applied to standard blue livery – 35024's scheme only lasting for 18 months before being repainted in standard blue. The only picture available was taken just after painting and it did not have its nameplates on. 35011 and 35023 never had the blue livery applied and retained Malachite Green until they received Brunswick Green.

LONDON MIDLAND REGION

'Princess Royal' 4-6-2s - Of all the classes that received BR blue the 'Princess Royals' were the least to be blessed. Only four engines received the standard blue before BR green was universally applied. Interestingly, 46204 retained its LMS red until it received BR green in 1952 and 46200 retained LMS black until receiving BR green in 1952. As such

in 1951 the 'Princess Royals' could be seen in five different liveries. **'Princess Coronation' 4-6-2s -** A

'Princess Coronation' 4-6-2s - All but 11 of the class received either the experimental purple/blue or standard blue. In addition 46234 had received a further experimental colour described as grey/blue in March 1946 - perhaps a surplus can or two of RAF grey/blue had been used? The locomotive was repainted into BR black in October 1948 but therefore carried its unique colour for six or seven months of the new nationalised railway. All the others apart from 46221, 46226, 46234, 46243 and 46252 were in LMS lined black until they received the colours indicated in the table. These had all been in plain black apart from 46234 which was in the grey/blue colour. Interestingly a 'Princess Coronation' remained in blue longer than any other locomotive - 46254 did not

receive its BR green repaint until October 1955 and 46251 retained BR black until that year too.

EASTERN REGION

'A1' 4-6-2s - All of the Peppercorn 'A1s' received BR standard blue. The locomotive which carried this livery for the longest period was 60152 with which the colour scheme lasted three years and four months. The shortest was 60149 which only carried the livery for 10 months. 'A1/1' - This class was formed by the 1945 Thompson rebuild of Gresley's original 'A1' 60100 built for the Great Northern Railway in 1922. This carried a previous blue livery from rebuilding in 1945 until 1947. It was painted a royal blue very similar to the old

Great Eastern Railway blue and was lined out with two thin red lines and, unusually for Doncaster, the cylinders were also blue with a single red line at each end. 'A3' 4-6-2s - All but two 'A3s' received the BR standard blue and seven of them ran for a period in the experimental purple, although only for one or two years. The first three locomotives received the standard blue in May 1949. The last locomotive to receive BR green was 60104 in June 1953. All 'A3s' were running in LNER apple green until receiving either the experimental blue or standard blue. 60070 and 60076, which never ran in blue, continued in apple green until receiving BR green in February and March 1952 respectively.

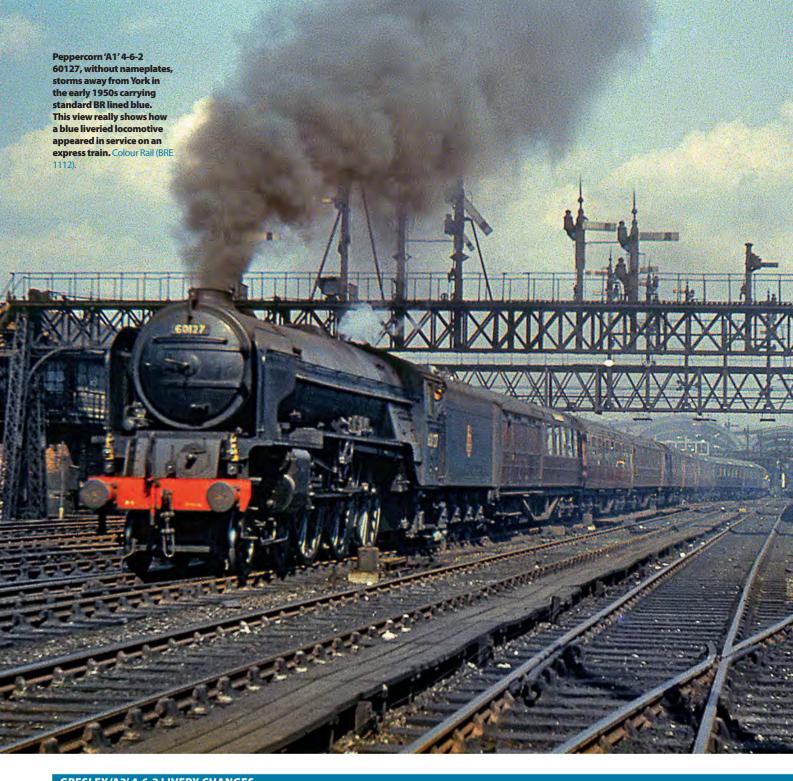

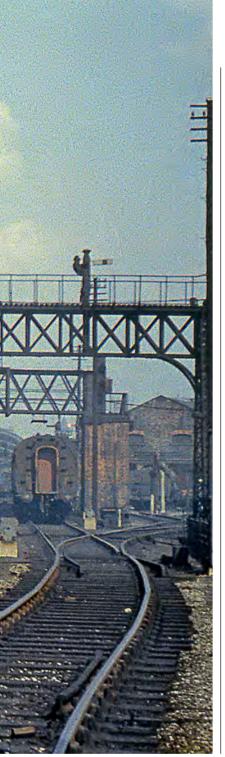

BR BLUE PERIOD



'A4' 4-6-2s - All 'A4s' received the BR standard blue and four also ran in the experimental purple - 60028 for two years and four months. The last locomotive to go into BR green was 60026 which lasted until January 1953. Between 1948 and 1950'A4s' could be seen in three different blue liveries, as several still retained LNER garter blue with British Railways or LNER on the tender.

The A4s' carried various numbers and logos during this period and for full details I recommend *Locomotives of the LNER Part 2A* by The Railway Correspondence Society.

'W1' 4-6-4 - The lone member of this class, 60700, retained garter blue with British Railways in full on the tender from June 1948 until January 1951. It was then adorned with the standard blue which it retained until May 1952. It was the only unnamed locomotive to carry this colour scheme.

If you require any further information on colour changes and other modifications I recommend for the 'Kings' Peto's *Great Western Railway Locomotives*. For the 'Merchant Navy' I recommend *Locomotives in Detail Part 1 Merchant Navy Class*. For the LMS, *The Book of Princess Royal Pacifics* and *The Book of the Coronation Pacifics* and the LNER is well covered in the RCTS book *Locomotives of the LNER*.

BLUE IS THE COLOUR

When it comes to ready-to-run models both Bachmann and Hornby have delivered a number of locomotives for 'OO' gauge in both the experimental purple/blue as well as BR's standard express lined passenger blue. This includes Peppercorn 'A1' and 'A4' 4-6-2s by Bachmann and 'King', 'Princess', 'Coronation', 'A4' and 'A4' classes by Hornby.

Until the 2017 release of the airsmoothed 'Merchant Navy' it wasn't possible to buy a ready-to-run version of these popular Southern 'Pacifics' in lined blue – other than a model of rebuilt 'Merchant Navy' 35005 Canadian Pacific in its preservation era blue – but in 2019 Hornby is set to release a model of 35024 East Asiatic Company in standard BR lined blue (Cat No. R3632). Also inbound, and due to be released in December 2018, is Stanier semi-streamlined

'Duchess' 4-6-2 46225 *Duchess of Gloucester* in BR lined blue (R3682).

Currently available in BR lined blue is Hornby GWR 'King' 4-6-0 6025 King Henry III (R3410) while Bachmann's model of Peppercorn 'A1' 4-6-2 60122 Curlew has the same colour scheme (32-561). If you are looking for other classes then the second hand market is the place to start and it will be well worth the effort to introduce a splash of colour to an early 1950s' period layout.

Frog switching

Adding a frog switch can improve the electrical reliability of live frog points. **MIKE WILD** explains how it is done using a Peco frog switch while discussing alternative means of frog switching for Digital control.

TOOLS

- » 25W soldering iron with 2mm nib
- » Electrical solder
- » 7/0.2 equipment wire, two colours
- » Wire cutters
- » Wire strippers

Adding a frog switch means that power flow through a point no longer relies on contact of the blades, increasing its reliability.

HE continued operation of a model railway point in its basic format relies on consistent contact between the point blades and stock rails. If there is dirt between the blades and stock rails the point may fail to provide proper electrical continuity leading to locomotives stalling.

This is simple to resolve at the construction stage with a simple set of modifications including a frog switch. With around five to ten minutes work any point can be made 100% reliable by installing a frog switch.

Using a point out of the box, the blades are used to transmit power through the point and change the polarity of the frog using the standard wiring. Adding a frog switch means there is a specific device to change the polarity of the frog section of a turnout – the central area on a point where the two routes divide – and by adding bridging wires between the stock rails and switch rails (the section of rail

connected to the blades) this removes any reliance on the blades for electrical contact. In turn this makes the point 100% reliable.

When installing a frog switch it is essential to isolate the frog as detailed in the Peco point instructions as failure to do this will result in electrical shorts.

This is all simple to achieve with basic soldering skills and tools and can be done, with care, with any live frog 'N', 'OO' or 'O' gauge point – this modification will not work for insulated frog points. The result is a fully reliable track formation which will work time after time.

The step by step guide explains the process involved for a Peco PL-13 frog switch, but the same basic principles apply to DCC based frog switches too. Each device comes with its own instructions and we recommend reading these in full before making any modifications to your points.

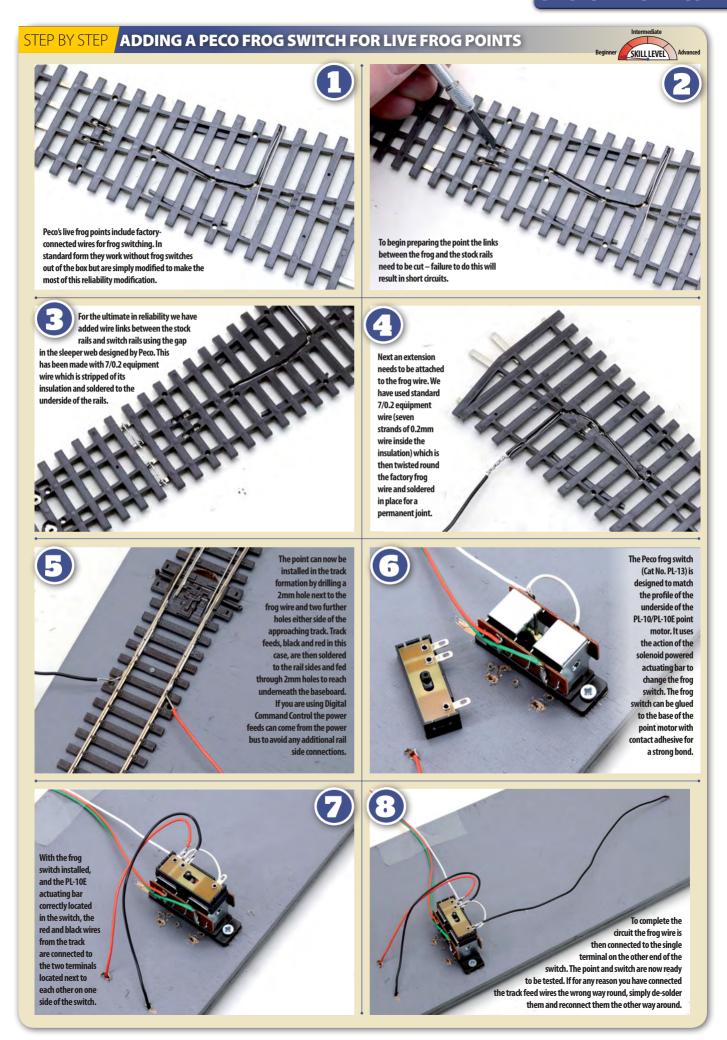
The alternatives

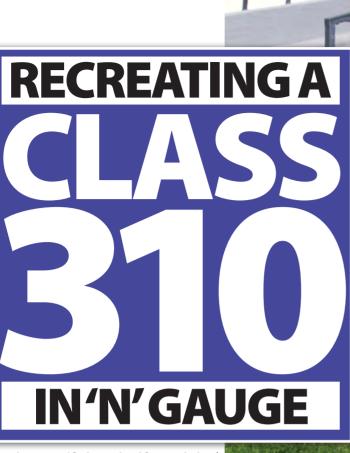
For this guide we have installed a Peco frog switch, but there are a number of alternatives including DCC Concepts Cobalt IP stall motors and automatic frog switches such as the Autofrog produced by Gaugemaster. From left is the Peco frog switch, as illustrated in the step by step guide and suitable for use with Peco PL-10/PL-10E point motors only. Next is the Gaugemaster Autofrog which can only be used with Digital Command Control but is a standalone device which can work alongside any point motor (or none at all). These Autofrogs can also be used in pairs for digital layouts where diamond crossings, single or double slips and threeway points are to be installed.

Both the analogue and digital versions of DCC Concepts

Cobalt IP stall motors include frog switches which can switch frogs using the appropriate power source – the Cobalt IP digital can only be used for frog switching with digital layouts while the analogue version can only be used to switch frogs with analogue power. The wiring of each is similar with the DCC powered frog switches being best connected to the DCC power bus with the frog wire from the point linking back to the motor.







With no off-the-shelf model available, **NIGEL BURKIN** shows how to convert Graham Farish Mk 2 coaches into one of the WCML EMUs using transferrable modelling skills.

O READY-TO-RUN model of the Class 310 Electric Multiple Unit (EMU) is currently available and, for the foreseeable future, that it is unlikely to be produced in either 'OO' or 'N' gauge. The real trains were introduced in 1965 for suburban services originating from London Euston including local services on the West Coast Main Line and suburban services in the Birmingham, Walsall and Wolverhampton area. Consisting of four cars with no cab gangways, the design was particularly pleasing with curved corner windscreens and an integral bodyshell design which was quite different from Mk 1-based EMUs of the time.

There was no gangway between the Motor Brake Second (MBS) and Trailer Second (TS) vehicles, effectively in the middle of the unit. A gangway was fitted together with flat windscreens as the units went through heavy overhauls in the 1980s. They rode on a bogie design similar to the B4 bogie which gave an exceptionally good ride. The coach profile was not dissimilar to the early Mk 2 designs, a point that modellers can use to their advantage.

Class 310s lasted on WCML suburban services until they were displaced by Class 317s and

the introduction of the Class 321 which saw them reallocated to the London, Tilbury & Southend route except those adapted for West Midlands suburban services which became Class 310/1. Initially operated as four car sets, the sub-class was reduced to three cars in the mid-1990s before gradual withdrawals saw all of the units out of traffic by 2002.

MODELLING HISTORY

It is the former Regional Railways Class 310/1 in three-car formation as operated by Central Trains that is the subject of this article. It is a compact three-car EMU ideal for my'N' gauge

Dudley Heath layout which is inspired by the suburban lines of the Black Country from 1995 to 2004. It will supplement a fleet of Graham Farish Class 150/0 and 150/1 units on local trains.

Conversion and adaptation of some ready-torun models was required to complete a model that captured the character of the Class 310. For that, I turned to vinyl overlays and 3D-printed cab mouldings supplied by Electra Railway Graphics – a popular method of modelling 'N' gauge stock not currently available in readyto-run form. The same techniques can be used to model Class 310/0 and Class 312 EMUs.

One of the advantages of older Graham Farish

coaches is that the bodyshells were produced as clear-sided blanks to which the appropriate window and door format was printed in place to give both the impression of flush glazing and allowing a wide variety of different coaches to be produced. This was particularly effective for Mk 2 and Mk 3 stock which allows the modeller some interesting coach conversion opportunities with printed vinyl sides.

The base coaches for this project are Mk 2 coaches of which I needed three. The original livery did not matter at all – it was about to be stripped back to the clear sides ready for the overlays to be applied. Another benefit

is that the B4 bogies fitted to the coaches are a close match to Class 310 bogies – and the roof profile is very similar too. The conversion is straightforward except for the need to fit cabs to two of the coaches and a pantograph well in the middle coach or MBS vehicle. If you plan to model a straight Class 310/0, you will need four base models.

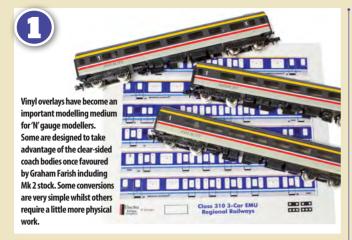
A CLEAR START

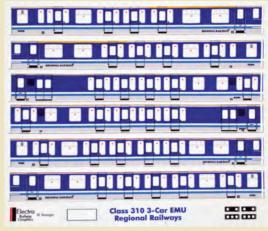
Graham Farish coaches with clear bodyshell mouldings have been produced by the original Graham Farish company when based in Poole and latterly manufactured in China by Bachmann. The finishes vary between the two manufacturing sites which determines how the printed paint finish should be stripped. The easiest way for both is to use a paint stripper such as Phoenix Precision Superstrip that removes factory painted finishes without risk to the plastic itself.

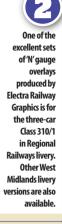
All the detail has to be stripped to the clear sides. Electra Railway Graphics suggests the use of nail varnish removal pads as ideal for dealing with the older Poole-made models, a task which takes time and effort, but is quite cheap. Several pads are needed per side and the residue must be washed away swiftly so not to stain the plastic.

Paint stripper such as Phoenix Precision >>>

STEP BY STEP BUILDING A CLASS 310 EMU IN 'N' GAUGE



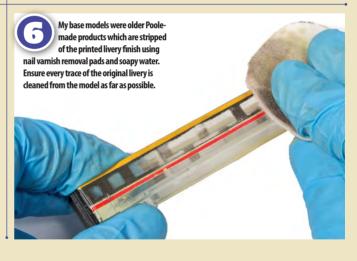












Superstrip is the preferred option for Chinese-made models and better than the use of nail varnish removal pads which may damage the plastic which appears to be different in composition from the original Poole models. The three base models used in this project were older ones made in Poole, which could be treated with nail varnish remover. After I had stripped away the printed livery detail, I found the sides were slightly discoloured. This did not matter because I intended to varnish the completed coaches to remove the shine of the printed vinyl sides.

CAB CONVERSION

There is some detailing and conversion work to undertake before applying the vinyl overlays. I

bought two simple cab mouldings for a Class 310 which were made using 3D printing techniques. Some changes to the shape of the mouldings were needed and I discovered that the slightly grainy finish of the 3D process was very difficult to smooth down and the mouldings hard to file and shape, particularly where they had to be adapted to match the profile of the coach roof mouldings.

Having made some minor changes to prepare the cabs, I used one to determine where to cut the coach and roof ends off to fit them to what would become the Driving Trailer Composite (DTC) and Driving Trailer Second (DTS). Unlike Mk 2 coaches, the inner ends of AM10 stock (the original designation for the Class 310s) are flat rather than bowed and must be changed.

I cut the inner ends from the coach bodyshells and replaced them with flat ends of 40thou styrene card – a little filling was needed around the edges and care had to be taken not to mark the clear sides with adhesive. The gangways are fitted to an extension to the ends which was fitted using 40thou card too. At the same time, new headstocks to replace the ones clipped into the coach body were made up from strips of the same 40thou styrene card.

CONVERTING THE MBS

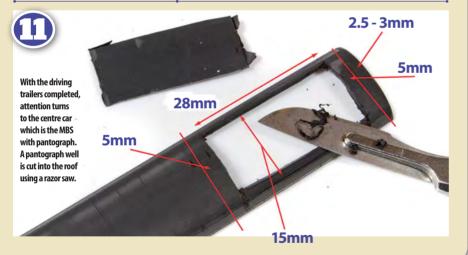
The key feature of the MBS is the pantograph well which has to be large enough to accommodate a Dapol Stone-Faiveley AMBR pantograph. An opening was cut in

the end of the roof to be located over the guard's van area of the coach. A 15mm x 28mm hole was cut 8mm inboard from the outer end of the roof. This was opened up by 5mm on each side with a curved profile to match the curve of the roof making the inboard distance between the opening and the end of the roof to be about 3mm.

A piece of 40thou styrene was cut and fitted into the opening to form the pantograph well floor. The sloped profile at the ends of the well and sides were made up with Squadron putty pared and smoothed to shape – several applications of filler being needed until the desired result was achieved. With the pantograph well prepared, the position of mounting

insulators for the pantograph were measured and small holes drilled through the floor to fit insulators made up of short pieces of 10BA screw thread which was done after the roof mouldings were painted. Three additional insulators were also fitted together with some wire and rod to represent the pantograph lifting gear.

ROOF VENTS

Class 310s are fitted with the round topped dome ventilators and 58 are needed for a three-car Class 310. Finding those ventilators for a model was tricky – it's worth having a search around for a household item which can be used to represent them if you cannot find some commercially available ones.

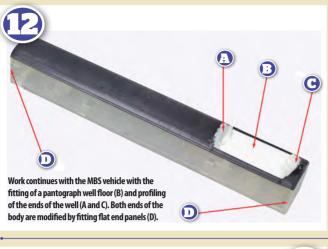

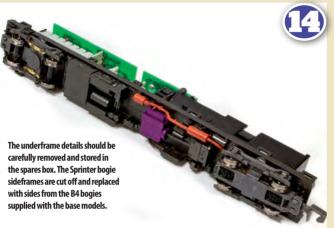

I had a bit of a brainwave when working on a completely unrelated project. A Hornby 'OO' gauge Class 423 was being worked on to upgrade the roof detail at about the time I was looking for a nice dome ventilator for the Class 310/1. The 4-VEP upgrading involved replacing the very undersize ones moulded on the roof mouldings with MJT Components scale dome ventilators. It struck me after paring off about half a dozen moulded vents that Hornby had solved the problem for me. The discarded vents were promptly rounded up and being less than half the size they should have been for 'OO' gauge, were soon applied, with the help of diagrams supplied with the vinyl overlay instructions to the roof of the Class 310/1.>>>

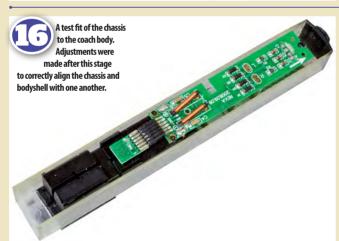
STEP BY STEP BUILDING A CLASS 310 EMU IN 'N' GAUGE

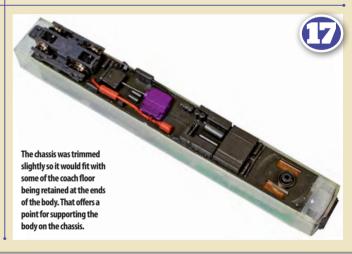












The spares have been put aside for a future project – just in case I need another Class 310.

MOTORISING THE MODEL

A tricky task for any EMU project of this type is motorising it. The lowered roof area in the MBS meant that my choice of drive chassis, a Class 150 one, could not be accommodated in the middle of the set. In the end, I cut the floor out of a coach which was to become a driving trailer to accept the chassis, leaving some floor at either end of the coach to fit headstocks and provide bearing pads for the body to sit neatly on the chassis. It all took a little trial and error, shimming with thin styrene card. It worked though, and the work was completed and tested before the cab mouldings were fitted.

PAINTING

A lot of conversion and preparatory work has to be completed even before a vinyl side can be applied. The cab fronts were primed first, further checked for marks and then painted warning panel yellow. Black was applied to the window surrounds and the headstocks, buffers and rubbing plates. The inner ends were painted black too.

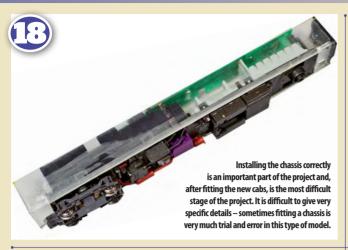
The roof mouldings are separate items and can be painted separately. I started with Railmatch roof dirt and finished with a dusting of lighter grey around the pantograph well. Underframes and bogies were also painted black and finished with some underframe grime together with brake dust. Bogie, roof and underframe weathering can be completed before the vinyls are applied.

THE VINYL COUNTDOWN

Applying the vinyls is a tricky little job that requires some care to get them straight and level. Fortunately, the Electra Railway Graphics vinyls can be removed and reapplied a couple of times without the risk of damaging them - if you are careful. They peel off the backing sheet quite easily as if they are self-adhesive labels or stickers. Before applying the vinyls, check for any dust or other particles left over from coach conversion work and remove them or they will show through the thin vinyl. When applying them, use the top edge of the converted coach bodies to align the vinyls before rolling them on along the length of the coach, taking care not to stretch or distort them. Attention has to be paid in making sure

the vinyl sticks along the tumblehome too. Look for trapped air which should be worked to the edge of the vinyl or the side partly lifted off to release larger pockets of air to ensure the sides sit properly on the coach.

The beauty of vinyl overlays is an immediate transformation to a new coach type as the vinyls are applied one at a time. There are some refinements that can be made to the technique. The vinyl may be further secured along exposed edges by applying a tiny bead of glue; running it along the tumblehome edge, for example. Use a CA glue intended for plastics such as Plasti-Zap and fit a new Zed-tip to the bottle for the tiniest application. Do the same to where the vinyl meets the coach ends too.

DETAILING

With the vinyl overlays in place and touch up painting around the edges completed, the model can be finished with small details. I applied the vinyl headcode panels to the cab fronts, the one with three marker dots being used on the DTC vehicle. The three dots helped those waiting on platforms to see which end of an approaching train had First Class accommodation.

I test assembled all three cars on the layout to look for any obvious issues with the manner in which the vehicles sat together and how well they would ride on the bogies. I noticed, during this adjustment time that the fit of the roof to ends was less than satisfactory. The bodies were subject to a little more careful finishing and touch

in painting before being assembled and tested once again with gangways designed to close up the coupling gap. Once happy with how the model looks on the track, it was off to the paint shop for varnishing and final weathering work.

Spraying the model with a coat of satin varnish will equalise the various finishes on the coach bodies and help protect the overlays from scratching. The model finally ended up with two thin coats which removed the shine from the sides and also gave the model a more 'used' appearance.

It certainly isn't a perfect model but overall I am satisfied with the result and the model, on its first outing, attracted a lot of interest, adding something different to the fleet of Centro Class 150s on Dudley Heath.

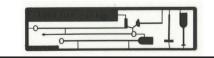

Memories of Bewdley railways

WAS VERY IMPRESSED with Graham Heald's layout of Bewdley (HM137). On the title page he's got a small map of the surrounding area around Bewdley and in between Cleobury Mortimer and Wyre Forest, a station called Brown Clee Hills.

I lived at Easton Court station house between 1953 and 1959. My mother's family lived in Birmingham and my father's at the Woofferton end. We used this route a lot in the 1950s, catching the autotrain known locally as the 'bomber' to Tenbury, then the railcar to Kidderminster, then onto a Snow Hill bound train, but I don't ever remember seeing the station Brown Clee Hills.

I, like Graham, liked everything GWR and BR Western Region. I started my spotting days in the late 1950s a dozen or so miles to the North of Bewdley at Woofferton. Like most kids my age, I used to have a Hornby tinplate clockwork train set every Christmas until 1961 when I got my first Hornby Dublo electric set.

At the bottom of the yard was a Permanent Way (PW) hut which was used by Titch Notingham, who used to walk the length between Tenbury and Woofferton, and Harry Davies, a portly man in a bowler hat and a face the colour of beetroot. During the sugar-beet season was the only time wagons would get dropped off the Kidderminster to Woofferton pick-up goods with 16ton mineral wagons for the local farmer, Harry Stevens. He'd bring his Lister elevator down to load the wagons.

Once in a while, Glyn Davies, a porter from Ludlow, would come to check the station and change the posters. My father, Tom Davies, was a PW man at Woofferton, under the ganger Bill Everall and knew all the railwaymen – he also used to get me lots of cab rides, the longest being from Easton Court to Leominster with the driver on the autotrain.

Station House had no electric, so we had a Tilley lamp provided by the railway and during the winter months mother had to take it onto the platform to show the driver of the 7.43pm if

there were any passengers or not, while we all sat in the dark until she came back – the only lights we could see were the BBC masts at Woofferton.

In the last few years we lived at the station, the only people I saw get on or off the train on very rare occasions were Jeff Flight and Nick Johnson who both worked at Lloyds factory in Tenbury and both lived in Little Hereford village.

On a Sunday there were no trains, so my brother and I used the platform edge whilst standing at track level to push our Dinky Toys up and down the platform. Then one Sunday, we heard a whistle. We looked at each other and around the corner from the Tenbury end a train appeared – you'd never seen us move so fast, leaving our Dinky Toys behind! It was an empty ballast train and on passing, the driver couldn't stop laughing. In 1964, we left to come to Birmingham and I soon got a job on the railway, first as a porter at Stechford station and then Saltley Loco, but that is another story.

controller, any user can quickly access the details. These are printed onto A4 sheets and laminated and held in a folder for easy access. The table below illustrates my sheets.

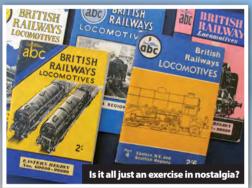

Heavy weathering for LANGERS HALLERS



TIM SHACKLETON explains how he created the extraordinary weathering effects on his collection of Eastern Region 2-8-0s for 'OO' gauge.



WEATHERING

NE of the few benefits to be gained from pushing 70 is that you still have clear memories of how steam locomotives actually looked. I'm not knocking the preservation movement – quite the opposite, as it is a tribute to the volunteers and skills that we can still savour steam on a regular basis - but to my eye the typical tourist line bears no more relation to the working steam railway I knew than a BBC costume drama can accurately capture the period it's meant to represent. If you didn't know either first hand you may think the historical recreation is excellent. If you did, you'll see a host of glaring errors and anomalies, from Sherlock Holmes hot on the chase behind a BR Standard 4-6-0 to leaflets with colour photographs being distributed on the streets of wartime London.

True, '9Fs' did once work branch passenger trains tender-first (the last day of the Alnwick-Alnmouth branch in 1966 for example) and in the 1950s an ancient 12-wheeled dining car was used for staff accommodation at Lyme Regis, but as for the ubiquitous 'Austerity' or Barclay saddle tank on a Santa Special or a 'Deltic' on a three-coach stopper, that's not for me, I'm afraid.

I enjoyed a whole decade of watching steam locomotives work for a living. I was also a modeller and in my early teens, during the last four or five years of steam, I discovered weathering. This meant that I could study my chosen subject at first hand. The outcome was an appreciation of the finer points and a genuine pleasure in observing how things actually were, rather than how I imagined they would be.

Today, we have to rely on photographs for reference – with very few exceptions, I wouldn't take much notice of how a preserved steam locomotive looks when it comes to weathering. Beautifully restored as they are, from a model railway realism point of view they don't provide the right vision.

There's nothing unusual or radically new in the way these various heavy 2-8-0s were weathered. What links them, I hope, is how consistent - and how consistently varied - the

results are, and how well the locomotives sit with one another – especially in terms of colour and tone. As you'll discover, I've used lots of different methods and media to achieve these effects, from the Humbrol enamels that I've been using for well over half a century to specialised

weathering products that have only lately become available.

Just remember, though, that none of it is unique to the heavy-haulers of the Eastern Region – it's merely that they seemed to show the effects of sheer hard work more readily and more obviously than most other locomotives!



WEATHERING EASTERN REGION HEAVY FREIGHT LOCOMOTIVES

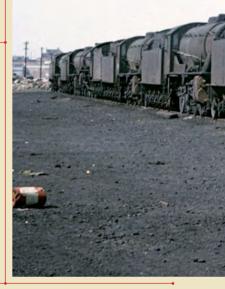


I read on one of the online forums that Tim Shackleton always starts the weathering process by applying an all-over coat of dark browny-grey. Well, that's certainly one of many ways I might approach it, so I thought I'd better heed my own advice. Using an Iwata Eclipse CS airbrush I applied three separate mixes – one darker, one lighter, one in the middle – of Lifecolor Burned Black (UA736) and Warm Wood (UA714) diluted 50:50 with Ultimate thinners.

I'd have failed in my duty over the last few years if I hadn't made you aware that there are many different ways of achieving the same weathering effects. Another way of setting the ball rolling is to coat the whole of the bodywork liberally with a coat of Mig AMMO Engine Grime (MIG-1407). Use a big flat brush for best results. This is a Bachmann '04/1' that will become an '04/3' by the simple expedient of removing the vacuum hose. The '04/1s' were the original Great Central design - the '04/3s' were those built during the First World War for the Railway Operating Division.



Immediately as much of the paint as possible is washed away with white spirit.
You won't get all of it off but that's precisely the point – it will collect in nooks and crannies and create interesting rhythmic patterns. You can do this with acrylics too but the drying time is far shorter, with less opportunity to work the paint.



We want an uneven paint finish, but not too uneven – just enough to create a subtly random patchiness that will show through under subsequent applications.

Having gone around hoovering up any unwanted paint blobs and build-ups I'll leave everything to dry for a good 24hrs before moving on to the next stage.

A Heljan '02' has now entered the equation - and honours are even after the first round.

All the subtle enhancements and detail touches apparent since the previous image have been achieved using weathering powders — an assortment of creamy greys on the running plate, rusty/earthy shades on the underframe and tender, dark grey on the smokebox. These large, rounded-end brushes — called filberts — are perfect for weathering powders. At some point the locomotive might even get its new number!



Soot, priming deposits and general grime are often washed down the sides of the boiler — an effect that's especially apparent in hard water areas such as South Yorkshire. These are the coloured washes that I used to create the distinctive streaking on my five project locomotives —'01,'02,'04/1,'04/8' and 'WD.' Basic airbrush weathering is very quick — especially with fast-drying acrylics — but the build-up of prototypical effects can only be done by hand and this does take time.



This is the kind of brush I use to apply streaks—they're called combs because the bristles have a ragged edge that's perfect for applying random streaks of thin paint.



Having added the streaking to the boiler, we've taken the weathering of the '01' on a stage or two but there's still much to do before I'm satisfied. I use airbrushes, paintbrushes and many other applicators such as sponges and sticks, but what unites everything I do is the common colour palette and having the same eye for what works and what doesn't.

Over an airbrushed coat of browny-grey enamels (in fact several different tints of the same three colours, as with the acrylic paints we used previously) I added individual streaks of grime sprayed through a stencil mask cut from a header card. Some were lighter, some were darker, dozens upon dozens of them until I had the effect I wanted. As we saw earlier, you can achieve much the same effect using comb brushes.

Just a hint of limescaling among the streaks and dribbles on the smokebox, inspired as ever by a prototype photograph. I don't like anything too 'painterly' so I used the tip of a wooden cocktail stick to apply the paint, washing it into streaks with a fine sable brush loaded with white spirit.

Hand-brushed hints of corrosion around the tender seams and firebox – anywhere there's water on a locomotive, there will be rust. My initial attempts were too bright so I toned them down with a gentle mist of weathering shades.





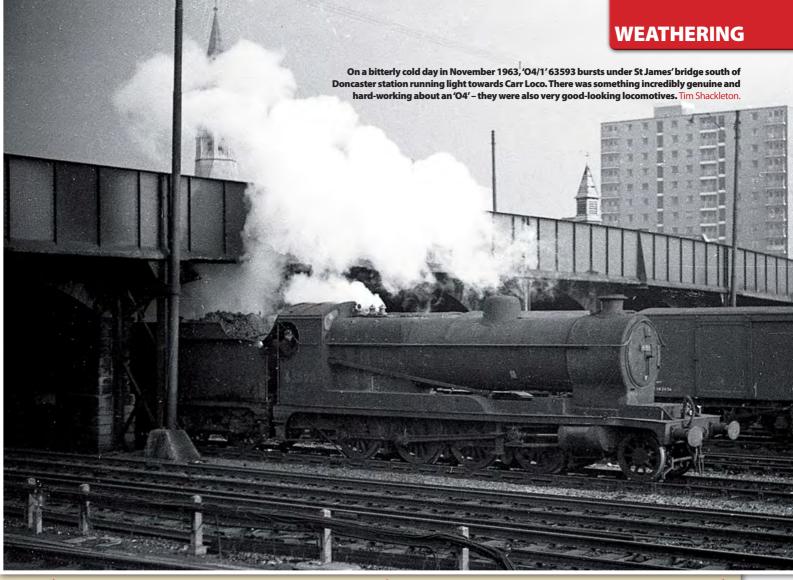


By contrast, apart from a single solitary streak of enamel, this '04/1' is entirely weathered using powders. I never use any kind of sealer or varnish on top of weathering powder – it makes the colours merge into one another. If a bald patch develops, add more powder.

Before and after – to create the streaking on the boiler I used a selection of washes from the Mig AMMO and AK Interactive ranges. When it's first applied, as here, it may be much too strident but it can easily be toned down by overspraying with a weathering mix.

You can see how the subtle build-up of streaking down the boiler helps break up the familiar black silhouette of a 'WD'. Unlike the '04/3' seen earlier, I used dozens of different colours on this locomotive. The round 'polo mint' on the cabside, by the way, indicates a Wakefield 'bonus engine' – a 'WD' in better condition than most that could be used on the sought-after bonus turns serving the Dearne valley collieries.

Once the streaking has been toned down with an overspray of LifeColor Burned Black acrylic (UA736), the locomotive suddenly starts to look like a 'WD' rather than a model of one. No weathering powder at this stage, though I'll use it to modulate the shades of rust on the smokebox and cylinders. Nor have I yet added the characteristic sheen to the motion using the luscious-smelling Mig AMMO Fresh Engine Oil (MIG-1408).





90360's boiler has been heavily modified to represent one of the many Eastern and North Eastern Region 'WDs' that were fitted with a different type of firebox, identified by the revised position of the washout plugs and the way both the handrail and vacuum ejector pipe are kinked to clear it. Often referred to as a 'Doncaster' firebox, they were in fact a Crewe production. As many as half of Eastern and North Eastern Region 'WDs' may have had this feature but you hardly ever see it modelled.

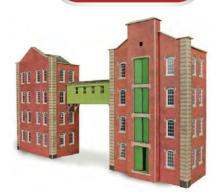

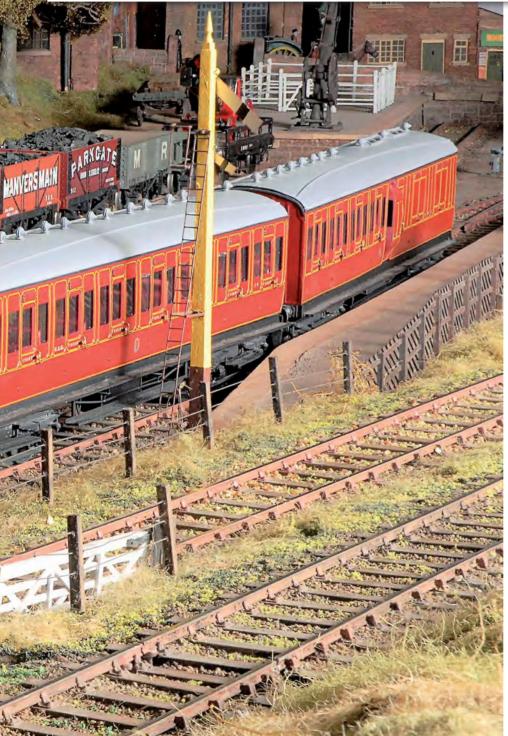


Wolfe Lowe

Designing a compact 'O' gauge layout where something can move at all times is tricky. **SHAUN HORROCKS** explains how it was achieved – and how a show-stealing scene was built.







OLFE LOWE MODELS a branch line terminus set in the early 1920s in Staffordshire. It has been built by Shaun Horrocks and Steve Moore, both members of the Macclesfield Model Railway Group (MMRG), and the design was motivated by our desire to build a country terminus exhibition layout with something moving at all times - not easily achieved in a compact 'O' gauge layout. This is why there is a secondary focus, the quarry, which gives the layout a purpose rather than just conducting random shunting movements.

We wanted the whole length of the layout to be scenic, with height differences and individual diorama features to keep viewers' attention. Most importantly there were to be no straight lines. The period chosen was around the 1923 grouping to fit the stock we already had, with a location around the Staffordshire moorlands. Operation was to be simple in order to maintain reliable running but we were also looking for an excuse for some electronic developments possibly including train automation.

Eventually we were inspired by Ian Rice's plan of Leinthall Earls and set to transforming it into Wolfe Lowe. The final plan was for a small terminus station at one end fed by a single track with a quarry accessed via a long switchback private siding at the other end. The two inclines of the upward switchback give the impression that the 'main' line is in a cutting.

Initially cassettes were used to change the stock but this proved too cumbersome and scary in handling. Reluctantly we sacrificed our objective of a fully-scenic layout and added a five-road full-train turntable on the end. Operation has since been much easier and slicker.

For ease of transport, we needed lightness and stability and selected 6mm plywood for the baseboards. Each scenic board is 4ft x 3ft 3in and 1ft 3in high with an open frame construction. The main strength comes from the double longitudinal beams, filled with expanding foam.

The train turntable top and pivot were reused from the old MMRG layout Hammeston Wharf with the addition of an open-frame supporting baseboard.

OPERATION

The main line sequence is for a goods train to be waiting in the yard for a passenger train to arrive, the goods train departs and the passenger locomotive runs around. A new goods train is received, the passenger departs and the goods locomotive runs around and usually exchanges a wagon or two for ones already in the goods yard.

Once off scene the trains go onto the full train turntable which can be rotated fully. Couplings are standard three-link except for quarry wagons which employ

Dingham Couplers for ease of reaching and are operated by strategically placed electromagnets. In main line trains the 'Dingham' wagons are butt-ended by buffer wagons with three-link couplings on one end and Dinghams on the other.

The quarry has two means of filling wagons. The first is a dummy hopper hiding an inclined plane down which grit moves only when the plane is vibrated - an idea inspired by the Alsager Railway Association layout Hassell Hill Colliery. The second is by emptying mine train tubs into a standard gauge wagon.

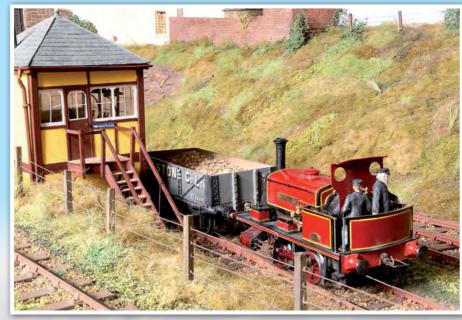
Loaded quarry trains are taken down the incline by a quarry locomotive, either just to the mid-point of the switchback (where a main line locomotive swaps full

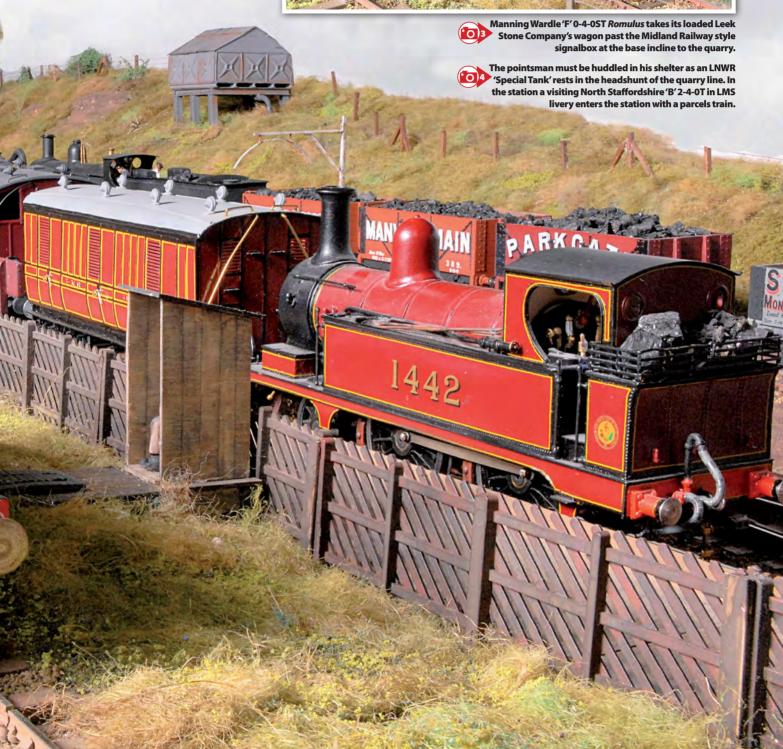


wagons for empties) or directly off-scene.

The initial concept was that the quarry would provide secondary interest between moves on the main line. However, in practice the tail is wagging the dog - viewers are attracted by the sound of grit being tipped in the quarry and then become fascinated by the automated mine train as it trundles to and fro.

ELECTRICS





the section of the quarry siding by the station can be operated by either controller to allow wagon exchange.

Points and signals are operated via servos which are driven by MERG Servo4 units. Relays, operated by servos via microswitches, in conjunction with the points provide both track isolation and LED point direction indication on the control panel. All electrical connections are hardwired via 25-pin plugs and sockets between the boards and to the control panels. With the benefit of hindsight, we may have been better using an electronic bus system such as MERG's CBUS to reduce wiring and provide easier extendibility.

The quarry mine train is the main focus of the electrics on Wolfe Lowe as it is fully automated, trundling back and forth filling and emptying itself. It uses a bespoke system developed by Stephen, controlled by a Raspberry Pi computer driving microcontroller modules, relays and servos. He also produced the driving software with a great emphasis on error recovery.

Just to tip a wagon, there is an infrared detector to confirm the presence of a standard gauge wagon to receive the tub's contents, a reed switch and matching magnet on mine wagons to detect when they are positioned for tipping, and three levers driven via rods from servos mounted at the back of the layout which hold the wagon chassis to prevent it being pushed over, push the wagon tub partway by moving vertically, complete emptying the tub by pushing horizontally. Finally there is an infra-red beam to ensure the tub is rotated and returned.

To fill a mine tub, grit is dropped from a hopper in measured amounts. This is achieved by two servos operating slides at the top and bottom of a small chamber under the hopper; both slides are normally closed. When a tub arrives the top slide is opened allowing the measured amount of grit into the chamber. The top slide is then closed and the bottom slide is opened causing the measured load to drop into the tub. Finally the bottom slide is closed.





A typical scene in the quarry with a Peckett 0-4-05T shunting standard gauge wagons while a local haulier fills his cart from the pile of loose stone and a mine train empties its contents into a standard gauge North Eastern Railway 20ton iron-ore hopper. The stone pile is a polystyrene mound coated with a layer of actual stone.

The Wolfe Lane End village store and two of the village's mills form a backdrop to a NSR 2-4-2T 54 standing at the station platform as the quarry's Manning Wardle 0-4-0ST waits on the headshunt for its load to be collected by a main line locomotive.

SCENERY

One of our initial thoughts was that straight lines and flat surfaces should be avoided to give a more interesting scene. For example, the main street gently curves as it climbs from below track level at the front of the layout to around 70mm above track level at the back. The combination of gradient and curve allows the buildings to be staggered, giving a much more natural appearance.

With the exception of the provender hut, buildings are scratchbuilt using a mixture of Plasticard, embossed brick card, scribed foamboard and DAS, wooden coffee stirrers and so on. Some of the buildings were recovered from Hammeston Wharf, but the majority are new. The main street has a plywood base covered with a thin layer

of DAS modelling clay with individually scribed setts which were painted with a base coat of emulsion followed by artists' acrylics and water paints for texture and weathering.

The landscaping is formed from polystyrene either carved to the land contours for the cuttings or cut into blocks for the quarry face. In both cases the polystyrene is covered with plaster bandage. For grassy areas the bandage is sealed with emulsion paint and topped with dyed felt teased into pieces. For the rock face a layer of undercoat plaster is added to allow further detail to be scribed to form the rock surface. Then the plaster is similarly sealed and detail colouring and weathering applied using acrylic and watercolour paints.

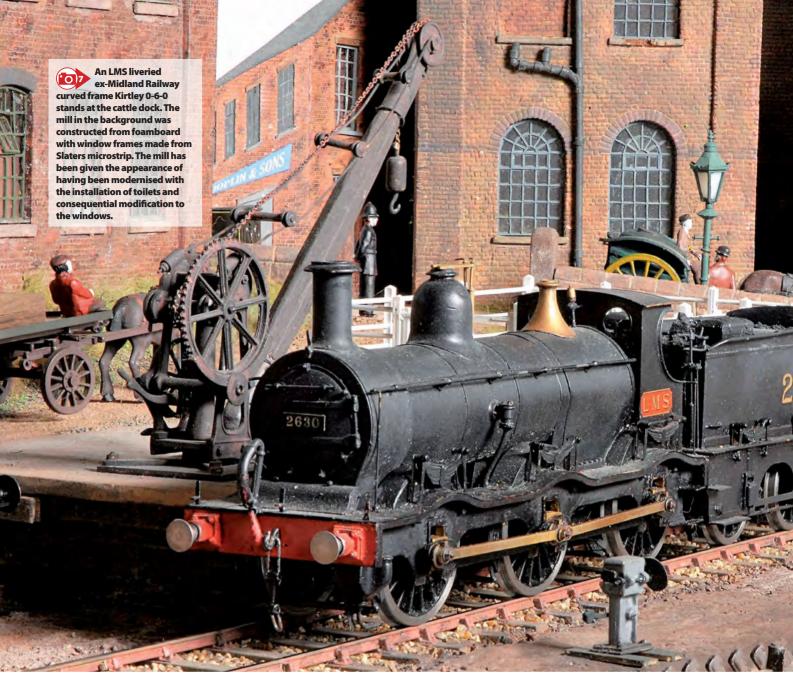
Trees are constructed from wire armatures

covered with a mixture of plaster, PVA and paint. Foliage is made from expanded hairdressers' postiche or horsehair which is spray painted and covered with scatter.

THE TURNTABLE

The table rotates freely in both directions thanks to having no electrical umbilical cord to twist! Power is fed through the spindle about which the table rotates and via a single bolt which also provides the track alignment.

Much thought went into fail-safe devices which to date, thankfully, have worked. Each road ends with a dead section to stop a train before it reaches the end of the turntable where there is a hinged metal bar to provide a physical barrier – just in case.



A microswitch cuts power to all of the table if the bar is not in place. Being a turntable, the 'end' becomes the 'beginning' once the table is rotated and so everything has to be mirrored. In particular the dead section break needs to be 'made' when the 'end' is swung round to allow trains to drive on and off. This is achieved via a microswitch which is engaged by the bolt which provides alignment and power. Finally, a pair of microswitches detect when the turntable is being rotated and isolate not just the table but also to the preceding track section.

ROLLING STOCK

Rolling stock is almost entirely kit-built and has been assembled over many years. However we are still building and adding to the roster of the London Midland & Scottish Railway (LMS) and its subsumed pre-grouping companies. A typical roster includes the following trains:

PASSENGER TRAINS

• London & North Western Railway (LNWR) 4ft 6in 2-4-2T coupled to a mixed rake of LNWR arc-roofed six-wheel coaches and a 42ft bogie Central Brake Third coach augmented by a LNWR fruit and milk van.

- LNWR motor train unit formed of an LNWR 2-4-0T and driving trailer to diagram M56.
- North Staffordshire Railway (NSR)
 2-4-2T with all Third and Brake Third
 NSR coaches, augmented with a
 Midland Railway (MR) milk van.
- Either a MR curved frame Kirtley 0-6-0 or '3F' 0-6-0 with a MR/LMS suburban bogie set occasionally with LNWR carriage wagon and horse box attached.

GOODS TRAINS

We have no fixed rakes for freight trains which are hauled by any of two LMS 'Jinty' 0-6-0Ts, an LNWR Webb 0-6-0ST and either of the MR 0-6-0 tender locomotives not required for passenger duty. Goods stock comprises mainly MR, LNWR and LMS with some different arrivals such as a London and North Eastern Railway well wagon and cask wagon. There is also a scratchbuilt NSR brake van which awaits the completion of the 'Old L' 0-6-2T.

QUARRY

The quarrymen's transport is provided by a pair of railbuses converted from Ford Model T chassis as used on some of Colonel Stephens' light railways. Shunting in the quarry and transport to the main line is handled by either a Manning Wardle 'F' class 0-4-0ST or a Peckett 0-4-0ST. The open wagons used in the quarry are standard kits some of which have been given fictitious liveries based on the layout's supposed location. The two iron ore hopper wagons are models of North Eastern Railway 20ton hoppers. There is also an extravagantly liveried ex-Rhymney Railway four-wheel brake van which is attached to loaded trains for their main line trips.

MINE

The mine railway is built to 'On14' standards giving a precise 2ft gauge. The tipper wagons and Diema diesel locomotive came from KB Scale. The wagons are light plastic kits modified to give the body extra resistance to being pushed off when tipped and with lead inserted at the bottom of the tub to ensure that it returns to normal after tipping.

The Diema kit has an etched brass body and nickel-silver chassis incorporating a 120:1 double worm reduction drive to both axles - an interesting challenge to build and achieve reliable running. That experience

proved useful when building a spare mine locomotive using a 3D printed body designed by David Malton and supplied by CWRailways on a scratch built brass chassis of similar design to the Diema's.

FINAL THOUGHTS

We always like to push the boundaries with each new layout and Wolfe Lowe has been no exception from the baseboard construction using expanding foam to the complex union of electronics and mechanicals in the mine. As with most layouts it has evolved and is now achieving the effect we were hoping for, but please, come and see it and judge for yourselves!

The contents of the mine tipper wagons have been emptied into a standard gauge wagon. The weight of the whitemetal driver makes a crucial contribution to the reliable electrical pick-up of the diminutive 2ft gauge Diema. The infra-red LED on the top of the wooden shelter is part of the automatic system's safety checks.



The Peckett 0-4-0ST positions a wagon under the hopper which purports to fill wagons with gravel. In fact the grit is delivered by a vibrating chute from a reservoir at the rear of the layout.



The Bull's Head public house has not opened yet as the local carter delivers a couple of crates to the station. The pub is constructed from scribed foamboard, as are the shop and mill further up the hill. The pair of houses in between is based on PLM castings. The wooden ironmongery shop is scratch built.

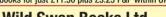

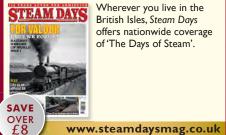

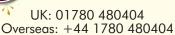

AUGE 'O' models are arriving in the Hornby Magazine office for review more and more regularly. This year alone we have seen the GWR'57XX'

0-6-0PT from Dapol, the '8750' and '57XX' varieties through Minerva Model Railways, the GWR'61XX'2-6-2T from Heljan, new wagons from Dapol, Hatton's and Minerva, new carriages from Darstaed and now the Class 25/3 is here too.

Heljan is already well versed in all things Derby Type 2 having previously released its model of the Class 25/1 in 'O' gauge. However, the new Class 25/3 is quite different on the outside as it models the final iteration of the fleet of 327 locomotives with a revised cab layout, grilles moved to cantrail level and changes to the underframe design on the outside.

The first of the Class 25/3s were delivered in 1965 with 79 being completed over a twoyear period by BR at Derby Works and Beyer, Peacock in Manchester. They were outwardly similar to the Class 25/2s built between 1963 and 1966, but also had detail differences in their generator and were the first of the design to use solid state electronics for their control system. Reality Check has the full story on

stem. Reality Check has the full story on development of the Class 25 fleet.

THE MODEL

Heljan's new'O' gauge model is being released in original BR two-tone green with small yellow warning panels, as per our review sample, as well as in the same colours with full yellow ends, pre-TOPS BR blue, TOPS era BR blue and TOPS era BR blue with factory weathering. Each locomotive features

directional lighting, cab lights, sprung buffers, working sprung screw link couplings, a rotating roof fan and twin motors providing all-wheel drive on these Bo-Bo locomotives.

Our sample was finished to an exacting standard in the distinctive and attractive BR two-tone green colour scheme with BR late crests on each side, overhead warning

flashes, builder's plates under the driver's side cab windows and a fully decorated bufferbeam with pipe ends picked out in the appropriate colours. Even the GRP roof panel is finished in cream against the grey metal roof sections. In fact the only point that we could pick on livery wise was the font for the headcode panels which was too heavy on our sample.

Physically, the body of the 25/3 looks spoton from all angles. The cab fronts have a correct curved profile across their face as well as neatly moulded marker light surrounds, lamp irons and handrail all of which add to the Class 25/3 character. Adding the finishing touchs to the front end are the windscreen wipers and bufferbeam pipework.

While we are at the cab, the interior is well worth viewing and Heljan has done an excellent job of moulding clear glazing to allow a good view of this area. The control desk is fully modelled with regulator and brake handles >>>

together with representations of the gauges in the desk. On the rear cab partition the door to the engine bay is modelled together with conduits rising from the floor. A secondman's seat is also provided and it will be a straightforward task to add a suitable crew to the cab interior once the body has been removed.

The bodyside and roof meanwhile are excellent renditions with the clean lines of the Class 25/3 being modelled superbly throughout. Details include the triangular rivet pattern on each side, neatly modelled grille covers, glazed engine compartment windows and separately fitted handrails. Covers have been attached over the bodyside steps, but these can be removed to reveal the steps/handholds underneath.

The underframe follows the high standard set by the Class 25/1, but importantly the central

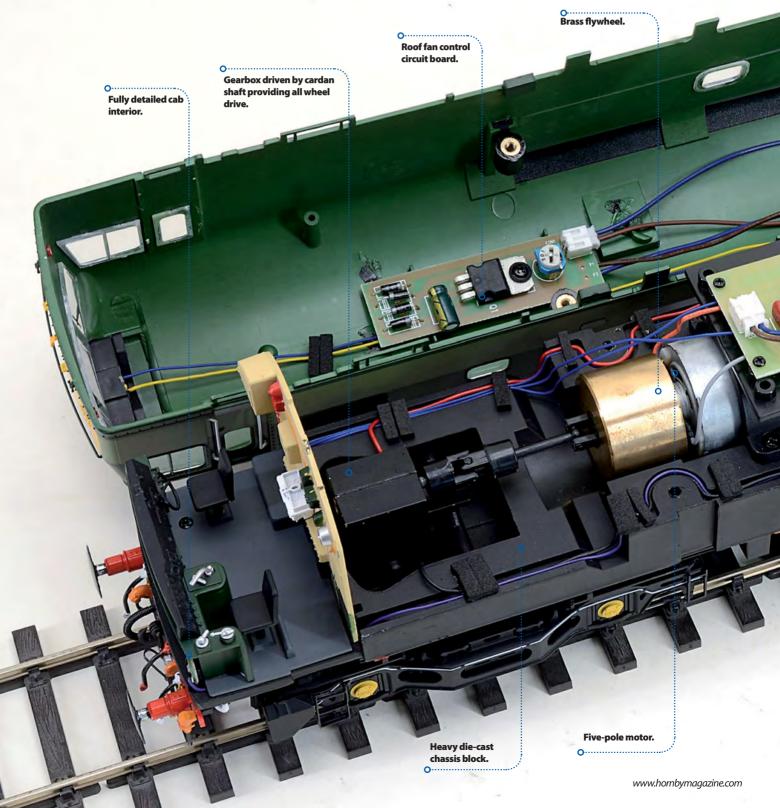


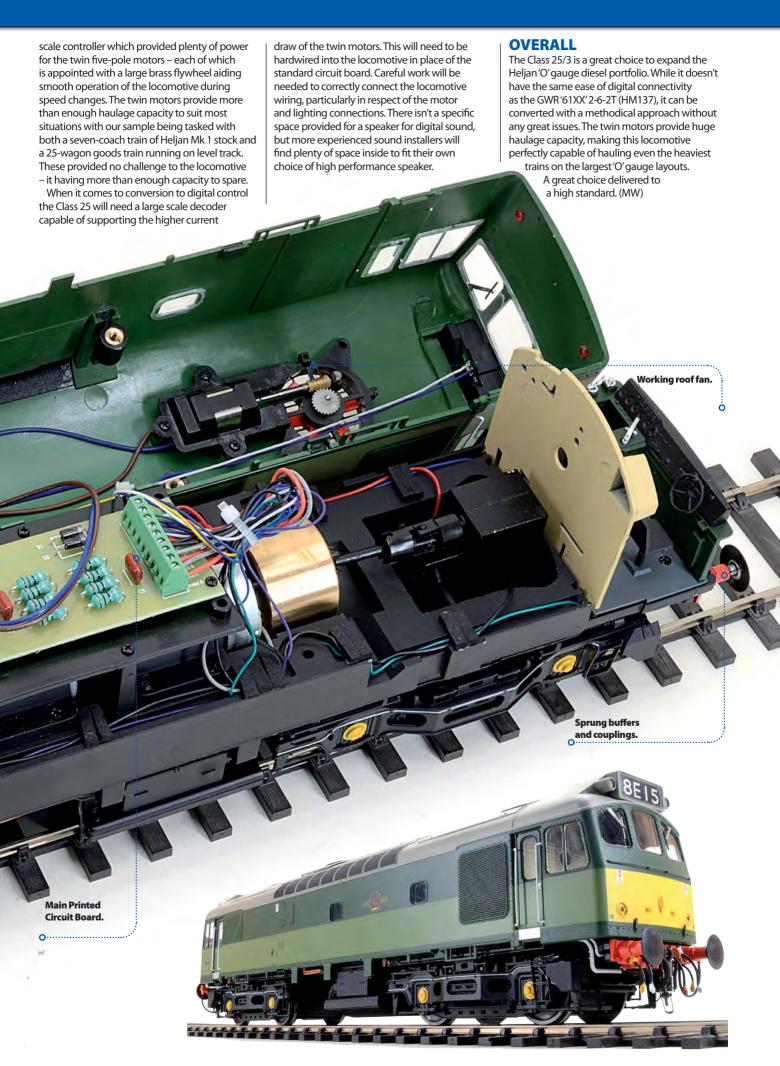
tanks are the short pattern used on the Class 25/2 and Class 25/3. The bogies meanwhile have superb relief detail as well as Timken roller bearing axleboxes, separately fitted steps, speedometer cables and sandboxes. Turned metal wheels are provided on metal axles and all of these collect current as well as being geared to the motors.

PERFORMANCE

On the track the 2kg model ran smoothly straight from the box and improved with running to offer refined speed control and consistent lighting. The roof fan kicks in above a certain voltage and adds an extra touch of realism to the locomotive when it is running.

We put this sample through its paces on analogue control using a Helmsman 5amp large

DERBY'S 25 3

Perhaps one of the most recognisable diesel locomotives of the 1960s was the popular and versatile Class 25. This design reached its best with its final version, the 25/3, which first appeared in 1965, as **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** describes.

T THE TIME of the British Railways Modernisation Plan of 1955, traffic requirements on the system were vastly different to those of today, and there were many trains which ran with light loads over fairly short distances. For these types of train there was a requirement for a reliable all-purpose locomotive with modest power which had been answered by

several new designs including a family of Bo-Bo Type 2s produced at Derby Works.

The Class 25/3 was the final development of this family, but as with all families the relationships between individual members are not perhaps as clear as might at first appear. Although the 80 members of this final batch are known as '25/3s', not all of them were numbered as such under TOPS and while they are much admired for their 'cleaned up' and redesigned bodywork they

also shared this feature with some, but not all, examples of earlier versions. To further complicate matters, production of the subclass was split between two different sites, with some locomotives actually switching intended builder during production.

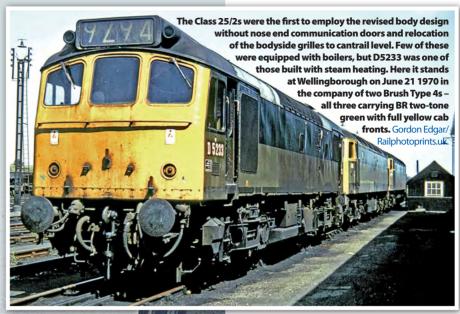
PILOT SCHEME ORIGINS

Eventually numbering 327 locomotives, the Class 25 could trace its history right back to 20 locomotives ordered by British



Railways from Derby Works as part of its pilot scheme to evaluate different types of diesel locomotive against each other. The first of these mid-range locomotives appeared in July 1958, being fitted with a Sulzer six-cylinder engine and mounted on two four-wheel bogies, and proved itself to be a reliable and competent performer, so much so that further orders were soon placed, leading to an eventual construction of 151 machines, which were eventually to become Class 24.

The Class 24 was not a design that was pleasing to the eye. The appearance of the front end had been greatly compromised by BR's insistence on the inclusion of nose-end doors, which were intended for the use of the crew when locomotives were working in multiple. This resulted in the centre cab window being smaller and higher than the outer two and created plenty of draughts for the enginemen through the seldomused doors. Another issue was the design





of the bodyside, which was peppered with grilles, and which over time was found to allow too much debris and dust to enter the engine and generator compartments.

Later locomotives had a four-character headcode box added above the front cab windows, although the mechanical layout remained the same, and this body style was carried over to the first of the Class 25s, which arrived in 1961, as a development of the earlier engines.

The major difference between a Class 24 and a Class 25 is that the latter was fitted with a new version of the Sulzer 6LDA engine which in its 'B' form produced an additional 90hp, due to a redesign of the fuel pumps and cylinder heads and by the use of charge air cooling. The additional power available was used to raise the maximum speed of the locomotive from 75mph to 90mph, although this was at first done at the expense of some haulage power. The main generator was the same as fitted to the Class 24 but the traction motors were geared differently. Appearance-wise they were impossible to tell apart from the later Class 24s.

By the time another batch of Class 25s was required, the supplier of the original traction motors, British Thomson Houston, had amalgamated with Metropolitan Vickers to form Associated Electrical Industries, or AEI for short, and as a result of this the '25/1s' were fitted with a new traction motor, the AEI253AY. This motor was lighter than its predecessor but offered superior performance. Six stages of field weakening were employed which enabled full power to be used over a greater range of speeds. The Class 25/1 had a slightly revised headcode box, which had at the side of it additional cowlings to accommodate the warning horns, which were repositioned from underneath the front.

REALITY CHECK

for the opportunity was taken to tidy up the look of the locomotives, which in the process lost their bodyside grilles in favour of another set in the usual location on the cantrail and also had a cab-front redesign which saw them fitted with three large windows and elimination of the nose-end connecting doors. This redesign was complemented by a new two-tone green livery similar to that used on the then new Class 47 being built by Brush.

FINAL DESIGN

The final, and some would argue the most successful, version of the Class 25, which was to become known as the Class 25/3, came about due to the adoption of a revised generator design which had 10 poles instead of the 12 used previously. On this generator, field weakening was initiated at set speeds by electric signals generated by a rev counter which had the result that maximum power was available over a greater speed range than before, including up to a maximum of 80mph. This batch was also fitted with train air brake equipment from new, while earlier versions had it fitted retrospectively as they went through works.

Although all the earlier locomotives had been built by BR itself, either at Derby or Darlington, unusually the '25/3s' were shared between Derby and private builder Beyer, Peacock. A total of 26 were ordered from Derby at a cost of £70,348 each while the 54 from Beyer's were priced at £68,150. The decision to order from a private company caused something of a stink as it happened at the same time that BR was closing down Darlington Works, from which the jigs were transferred to Gorton, near Manchester, but a campaign

for the work to be done there eventually failed and the works closed as planned.

Unfortunately by this time Beyer, Peacock itself was in dire financial straits and, although it managed to build 36 of the locomotives that had been ordered it sought permission to be released from the rest of the order, resulting in D7660-D7677 being completed at Derby instead.

It was one of these engines, D7660, which was the first of this type to be turned out from works new in BR blue with full yellow ends.

IN SERVICE

As might be expected with such a large class, the '25s' found work in most regions of the country, although the majority were employed on the London Midland, Eastern and North Eastern Regions. The '25/3s' were mainly allocated new to Willesden and Toton, although D7611 to D7623 were

earmarked for 65A Eastfield but the rapid changes brought about by the elimination of steam saw the Eastern Region's locomotives going to the Midland and the Midland swapping its Class 27s for a similar number of the Scottish Class 25s. By the end of the 1960s the largest allocation was to the Nottingham division which at the time had 90 of the various types of Class 25s.

The locomotives were mostly employed on freight work with typical duties being coal trains, particularly in the Midlands, pick-up goods and van trains but they were also regularly employed on stone trains in the Peak District, including the ICI Northwich to Tunstead workings. During the summer holidays they would often be turned out on relief or excursion trains and they could often be found on parcels workings.

During their working lives the Class 25/3s were considered to be a reliable design,

although the AEI traction motors were found to be less robust than ideal, and indeed failed more often than the earlier version. There were some stress issues and resultant cracks to the engine blocks but these were less pronounced than on the related 12-cylinder designs, probably because the locomotives were not worked as hard on a continuous basis. One issue which became significant in later years was that of corrosion, particularly to the cabs and floors, although the Beyer,

Peacock locomotives were considered to be slightly better in this respect.

Throughout the 1970s the traffic for which these versatile engines had been designed declined, as many lines and freight facilities were closed so that by the end of the decade there was not a great deal of work for which they were suitable. Withdrawals commenced in 1982 and were accelerated when the costs of corrosion repairs were considered to be uneconomic. In 1985 12 of the stragglers of Class 25/3 were put together in a pool intended for allocation to salt traffic from Winsford in Cheshire. With severe restrictions put on their use and a cap on repair costs they were renumbered into the '25/9' series but soon succumbed to withdrawal when the intended traffic failed to materialise.

Meanwhile, three examples had been converted for use in Scotland as mobile generators for use on trains where the locomotive had no electric train heating equipment. 25305, 25310 and 25314 became 97251, 97250 and 97252 in that order and were referred to as 'Ethels' or Electric Train Heating Units. All three had their traction equipment isolated

and had been scrapped by 1994.

Despite the corrosion issues the Class 25/3 proved to be a popular locomotive with preservationists with the result that nine survived the cutter's torch to find a second career on our heritage lines. These included 25322 (D7672) which found fame in its last years as a training locomotive at Leeds (Holbeck) where it was given the name Tamworth Castle. Of the rest D7628 (25278) can often be found working into the Network Rail station at Whitby on services from the North Yorkshire Moors Railway but so far this is the only preserved example that has seen National Rail metals since withdrawal. Many of the remainder are undergoing repairs with predictably corrosion being the biggest issue that has to be tackled.

It is hard to come to terms with the thought that it is now more than 30 years since the last of these popular little workhorses with their characteristic spluttering exhaust found their way round the network. They were very much a product of their time and it is unlikely that we will ever see a requirement for such an all-round medium power workhorse ever again but if we did then the Class 25/3 would still ideally fit the bill.

GWR's current green livery is a popular choice for Hornby this month. As well as the latest version of the Class 800 unit (see review above), Hornby has also released its second pair of power cars in the gloss green livery of the Great Western Main Line Train Operating Company (TOC).

Featured in the new pack are 43041 Meningitis Trust Support for Life (powered) and 43005 (unpowered). As standard for Hornby Class 43 power cars

both are equipped with 8-pin decoder sockets and space for a 40mm x 20mm speaker as well as directional lighting. 43041 contains a heavy die-cast chassis which supports a powerful five-pole motor with twin flywheels

giving it plenty of power to haul scale length HST formations. As with the previous set

of GWR liveried power cars, 43187 and 43188 (Cat No. R3510) released in 2017, 43041 and 43005 both have a gloss finish to their

paint work which is neatly applied. It is offset with printed silver GWR logos – etched replacements are included in the box - yellow cab fronts, white handrails and black roofs and underframes.

Throughout these power cars are produced to the highest standard and they will make a perfect accompaniment to the Class 800 and the latest batch of Mk 3 carriages in the same colour scheme. Excellent and available now. (MW)

GWR named 800010 at London Paddington on January 10 2018. when nameplates were unveiled revealing the names Paddington Bear on the first class driving end (PDTRBFO) and Michael Bond on the standard class driving end (PDTSO) of the five-vehicle unit.

Hornby's 'OO' gauge model is a delight, incorporating all the detail elements of previous releases (HM129) plus the additional printed elements that make this particular unit unique - namely the illustrations of Paddington Bear on selected sliding passenger doors. Not only that, the *Paddington Bear* name on the cab sides of vehicle 815010 also bears the paw print visible on the real thing too.

Decoration is excellent throughout with a high-quality evenly-applied GWR green paint finish relieved with silver lining and GWR lettering. Each vehicle features crisply printed running numbers, seat number signs, tiny door labels



and destination panels displaying London Pad, with the next stop for the service showing as Reading. The exquisite roof detail stands out thanks to the silver and grey roof, but it is the crisp full colour and line drawings of Paddington Bear that really make this model special. Each of the illustrations appears to be a transfer over the white painted doors, which is a neat solution, with the images repeated on the respective doors on the opposite side of the vehicle. Not all doors carry the images, with three sets of doors towards the centre finished in grey, as well as the first sliding door alongside the catering area of the first-class driving end.

This limited-edition model of 500 units comes with a certificate of authentication and is presented in a colourful box depicting Paddington Bear, to celebrate 60 years of this 'very rare sort of bear'. Perfect for modelling the latest railway scene on the Great Western Main Line. (MC)



Mk 3 roster

To expand on its 2017 released collection of GWR green liveried Mk 3 carriages, Hornby has produced a quartet of Trailer Standard Opens (TSO) in the popular and sought after present day livery. These will allow a complete rake of GWR Mk 3s to be created alongside the 2017 released models of the Buffet (Cat No. R4779), TSO (R4781 and R4781A),

and Trailer First (R4815). The new group of four TSOs, each with individual running numbers and carriage letters, feature the same high quality gloss green livery application as shown on the HST power cars and previous Mk 3s and they also now come with the NEM coupling pocket equipped bogies first seen on the Virgin Trains liveried Mk 3s (HM137). These Trailer Guard Standard (R4780) are factory fitted with European

style close couplings, but standard medium tension locks are also included in each box together with buffers - though the latter won't be required for HST stock.

Collecting a full rake of GWR liveried Mk 3s will rely on the second-hand market for the 2017 released vehicles as they sold through quickly, but if you have First Great Western liveried stock in your collection there have been mixed formations in service on GWR where the blue and green colour schemes have been seen side by side opening up more possibilities for colourful modern trains. Olivia's Trains TEA tanks

EW in from Olivia's Trains of Sheffield are the first production samples of its forthcoming 'OO' gauge
British Oxygen Company (BOC) cryogenic bogie tank wagons.

Introduced in the early 1970s, BOC's small fleet of wagons was utilised to transport industrial gases such as liquid nitrogen and liquid oxygen from facilities including Ditton (Widnes). There were a number of regular flows, one of which was to Broughton Lane (Sheffield) which saw them operating over the now-closed Woodhead route, hauled by Class 76 Bo-Bo electrics (incidentally, another exclusive 'OO' gauge model from Olivia's Trains).

Manufactured by Heljan exclusively for Olivia's Trains, a choice of 20 different TEA bogie tank wagons have been commissioned, with the first production models due to appear by the end of the year.

For review we received three examples finished as BOC liquid nitrogen tank 0030 with Gloucester cast bogies (Cat No. Olivia-01), BOC Gases tank 0040 with GPS bogies (Olivia-13) and BOC unbranded tank 0011 with GPS bogies (Olivia-19).

The bogies are also to be available separately to allow customers further customisation options.

Capturing the distinctive nature of the wagons well, they feature a neatly formed tank barrel which is securely attached to the underframe, hatch cover detail, safety valve, separately applied grab rails, lifting points and much more. Buffers are moulded plastic items, the model coming with factory-fitted rounded rectangular versions, but oval buffers are also included separately. Underneath, the split nature of the underframe is well-defined, as are the trusses, brake cylinders, handbrake wheels (two different types), equipment boxes and refrigeration apparatus.

Application of the BOC white and grey livery is excellent, as is the orange band that sits midway around the tank barrel on two of our review models – the band being more yellow on the liquid nitrogen liveried example. Each displayed variations on the theme, with crisply printed BOC branding, hazchem labels, warning notices and lifting point signage.

Coupling hooks are fitted to each bufferbeam and metal instanter couplings will be included separately for fitting at the end of a rake of wagons, together with air train pipes and main reservoir pipes. Pressure section covers, a safety valve cover, spare handbrake

Straight from the get-go, this volume offers a refreshing selection of images covering BR blue and BR blue/grey era Electric Multiple Units (EMUs), Diesel Electric Multiple Units (DEMUs) and locomotives. Our review sample packs each contained three individually numbered wagons finished in BR grey (Cat No. ACC1016-HUO-J) as HUO hoppers B334539, B334576

and B335532, and NCB dark grey (ACC1025-HUO-L) representing internal users 099, OE73069 and OE73081 based at Onllywn Colliery in South Wales. Six different triplepacks of individually numbered TOPS hoppers have been produced, together with one triple-pack of NCB wagons, this latter pack being limited to just 250 examples.

As with the original batch, detailing is superb inside and out and includes separately fitted

with each model featuring bespoke printed detail including TOPS data panels, numbers and even replication of hand-painted blanking patches, over which the new identities were applied.

Legible builder's plates appear on each underframe, while the bodysides of the BRTOPS wagons also feature what appear to be hand-brushed embellishments and maintenance data panels.

HE British Railways standard 20ton brake van is a vehicle that no layout set between 1949 and the mid-1980s can be without as these vehicles could be found across the country bringing up the rear of trains on a daily basis. Even after that period examples were still in service, including for nuclear traffic, into the 1990s.

The first prototypes were built in 1949 taking their design cues from an earlier London and North Eastern Railway vehicle. Series production began in 1950 and continued until 1961 with both vacuum fitted (diagram 1/504) and unfitted (diagram 1/506) vehicles being delivered. In total more than 5,000 were built.

Such is the versatility and popularity of the BR 20ton brake van that it has been the subject of

numerous models in both 'OO' and 'N' gauge, but until now 'O' gauge modellers have had to build kits to model these vans. Dapol has stepped up to expand its range of ready-to-run steam era goods wagons as well as providing 'O' gauge modellers with this much needed vehicle. On release in October the new 20ton brake van has been made available in BR bauxite and BR grey liveries including the

Dapol delivered two brand new goods wagons for 'O' gauge during October with its eagerly awaited BR HAA merry-go-round hopper arriving at the start of the month to join the BR 20ton brake van (see separate review).

In total 11,362 HAA hoppers were built between 1964 and 1982 with the first entering service on merry-go-round services to Cockenzie power station in 1966. On these flows the new HAAs were loaded and unloaded on the move meaning that the train formation never had to stop while transporting coal to power stations.



superbly detailed with excellent plastic mouldings for the body, underframe and side steps. The roof is also removable making it simple to add a quard figure to the van. This van comes with standard axleboxes, as opposed to the roller bearings fitted to the final batches, and also features sprung buffers, working Instanter couplings on sprung coupling hooks, etched metal handrails and guard safety rails which can be positioned across the entrances or left hanging as required. A full complement of lamp irons is also supplied allowing realistic brake lamps to be added for the rear of a train.

With its turned metal wheels, this well-appointed new BR 20ton brake van runs freely on the track and is rightly proving to be a popular addition to the Dapol'O' gauge range. The initial batch covers BR bauxite and BR grey examples which are ideal for layouts set between 1950 and 1980. Excellent and available now. (MW)



Until the early 2000s these 45ton wagons were synonymous with coal traffic and were hauled by pairs of Class 20s, 37s, 47s, 56s, 58s, 60s, 66s and other classes.

The HAA has already been immortalised in 'OO' and 'N' gauge, but the 'O' gauge version is quite something. Weighing in at 400grams, it feels solid and well-built and happily Dapol has fitted each with free running metal axles supporting turned metal wheels meaning that long rakes should be a comfortable load for large 'O' gauge diesel locomotives. All are fitted with sprung metal

buffers and sprung coupling hooks equipped with working Instanter couplings. These bring the buffers face to face as standard once coupled up, but we still found our trio of samples ran happily around second radius Peco set track 'O' gauge curves as the buffers move freely in their shanks and compress as they would on the real wagons when running around curves.

The hopper bodies are superbly produced while the interior coal space is modelled down to the chassis which in turn has the flat hopper base doors of the prototype moulded underneath. The operating mechanisms are correctly modelled on each side while a full complement of brake shoes and levers are provided on each vehicle.

Decoration was nothing short of excellent on our samples which covered original Railfreight livery with red cradles and a later 1990s period wagon with a yellow cradle. Each had clearly printed numbers, tare weights and HAA codes together with solebar lettering while the data panels on the cradles were also fully legible.

A nice touch is that each

wagon comes with a pair of end of train lamps which can be added to the rear bufferbeam of a rake. Alternatively a standard lamp bracket, supplied in the same bag, can be fitted to vehicles within a rake.

The HAA hopper was to the diesel era what the 16ton mineral wagon was to the steam era. Any layout owner wishing to portray coal traffic between 1966-2010 can't fail to be impressed by these new wagons which Dapol has done a wonderful job of reproducing. Another great temptation for 'O' gauge. (MW)

BACHMANN'S POST OFFICE STOWAGE VAN ARRIVES



RAVELLING Post Office (TPO) trains can now be more realistic with the arrival of Bachmann's 'OO' gauge model of the Post Office Stowage Van (POT). These vehicles were introduced from the mid-1960s for the storage of mail bags on TPO workings and had a series of doors on each side to facilitate loading and unloading. The last were withdrawn with the end of TPO traffic in 2004.

Bachmann's new model is being released in BR blue and grey (Cat No. 39-755) as well as Royal Mail Letters red (39-760) and, as per our review sample, final Royal Mail red livery (39-765). It rides on a pair of B5 bogies and has small short arm tension lock couplings at each end mounted in NEM pockets.

Detailing of the 63ft long POT van is superb from all angles and

includes full relief underframe detail, neatly moulded bogie side frames, excellent carriage ends including lamp irons and cables, and correctly recessed doors on the bodysides. An accessory pack is included with each van too containing brake pipes and dummy buckeye couplings which



The Graham Farish range has been extended with the arrival of a new set of four Bulleid carriages in malachite green to model set S84. For review we received samples of Bulleid semi-open Brake Third S4019 (Cat No. 374-432) and Corridor Composite S5831

(374-462). To complete set S84 will require a matching Corridor Third (374-442) and a second semi-open Brake Third (374-432A).

Both of our samples were superbly decorated in BR era Malachite green with fine application of the lighter green base colour as well as the Southern Railway style first and third class markings. Handrails were also picked out in brass, while impressively the droplight handles had been decorated in the same colour on each vehicle. It is pleasing to see Southern Region coaches being made available to recreate prototypical sets and 'N' gauge modellers are sure to be pleased with these latest additions for early BR period scenes to operate with Farish Bulleid 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s. Bachmann has added a new variety of container to its range for the popular Conflat A wagon covering the BA non-ventilated container in Speedfreight colours. These containers were introduced in 1961 initially for traffic between London and Manchester. They had a new locking mechanism which allowed quicker loading and unloading. The last were withdrawn in the mid-1970s.

Bachmann's model of the BA container comes mounted on

a standard BR 10ft wheelbase Conflat A wagon. It is finished in BR bauxite as B737725 and has turned metal wheels and small tension lock couplings in NEM pockets. The container is finely detailed, as we would expect, including the side doors, ends details and roof detail.

Decoration is excellent too and these will make a colourful addition to goods traffic on a Midland Region layout set in the 1960s. (MW)

Oxford Rail's Adams 'Radial Tank' 4-4-2T is the latest subject for **JEREMY FAIRLIE-SMITH.** He shows how to add a Zimo decoder, speaker and 'stay alive' capacitor pack into this compact 'OO' gauge tank engine.



HIS ADAMS 'RADIAL TANK' was Oxford Rail's first 'OO' gauge ready-to-run locomotive (HM103). Oxford made modifications to the chassis design after the first version modelling 30583 in BR livery was produced, allowing the front bogie more vertical movement, and it has proved to be a reliable and capable locomotive. However, it has competition as Hornby also

and, considering only three survived into BR ownership on the Lyme Regis branch, there is plenty of choice on the market. This includes London & South Western Railway (LSWR), Southern Railway (SR) and British Railways (BR) liveried examples.

The subject of this project is Oxford Rail's model of preserved locomotive

488 in LSWR green. The real locomotive is based at the Bluebell Railway and is currently on static display at Sheffield Park as the only survivor of the class.

Oxford Rail has produced a factory sound fitted version which included a revised chassis design with changes to the metalwork in the bunker to accommodate a speaker and bigger decoder. However, the speaker enclosure

*F2 Brake key - When closing the throttle, the locomotive will coast and decelerate very slowly. To slow the train press F2 and the brakes actually work speeding up how fast the locomotive slows down just like a real brake control in the cab. was small and as a consequence the overall sound was pretty quiet. This version can be improved with a different approach to utilising the space in these models involving replacing and repositioning the speaker in the sound fitted versions which will improve them significantly. The techniques outlined in this step by step guide for the DCC ready version can be applied to the DCC sound

fitted models to reposition the speaker. In this guide I will be tackling the early,

pre-sound, chassis version which is very tight for space being designed for only a very small non-sound 8-pin decoder. To get the results we are looking for with sound and high power 'stay alive' so necessary in small locomotives we'll be using the Zimo MX648R decoder hardwired in, the Lais

DCC 16V'stay alive' unit (Cat No. 860009) with onboard charge circuitry and a Zimo 10mm x 15mm x 9mm cube speaker, (Cat No. LS10x15S). The sound file we'll use for this project is the Active-drive ZS036A Adams Radial Tank, a generic file created for two cylinder locomotives with early Southern Region whistles in character with this model. Read on to learn more.

STEP BY STEP

INSTALLING SOUND AND STAY ALIVE IN A OXFORD RAIL ADAMS 'RADIAL' 4-4-2T



The Oxford Rail Adams '0415' 4-4-2T is an easy model to open with two screws at the back and one at the front. The leading screw is accessed through a hole in the front bogie. The body lifts off without any other parts joining it to the chassis - no hidden pipes or wires to catch out the unwary.

This reveals the decoder fitting position at the back in the bunker space and the centrally mounted drive mechanism. The space for a decoder is very limited and only a very few standard 8-pin decoders will fit at all. At first sight it doesn't look very sound friendly let alone able to include fitting a 'stay alive' unit. However, at the front of the model there is a large space ahead of the motor which can be used for a speaker. There is also

There is also a cable route which can be used alongside other wires.



At the back of the body we start by preparing for the 'stay alive' and decoder by removing the coal load. The first stage is to firmly, but without squashing, grip, wriggle and pull out the water tank filler neck that protrudes through the coal load. Use some small smooth jawed pliers so as not to mark this part.

Then insert a small hooked tool through the hole you've just revealed to pull and unclick the coal. The coal rails themselves often come away too and these two parts can be refitted at the end of the process. All these parts are glued in but not very tightly and the several I've done all come apart with care.



This reveals the large sloping transverse void cast into the chassis which is the coal chute in the bunker. This is the new home for the

chute in the bunker. This is the new home for the 'stay alive' unit which fits perfectly in there. Drop it in now and secure with Black Tack or similar.



This will leave plenty of material so it can be re-glued to the bulkhead at the back of the cab later. Pass your 'stay alive' wires through their new hole into the bunker and place the body assembly to one side for now.





There is a small modification to be made to the cab backsheet that needs doing now. Trim off the lower curved section to allow the small shoulders on the outer edges of the sheet to drop down far enough to fit the body neatly with the 'stay alive' in place.

Take your speaker and solder two lengths of TCS decoder wire to the speaker terminals. Then insulate them to prevent short circuits. I use a couple of blobs of glue from a glue gun or a strip of tape to cover the terminals. Place the speaker in the front of your smokebox and secure with Black Tack. Then run the wires back along the boiler where they will meet the decoder wires a little later, route them over the motor and towards the rear of the body.





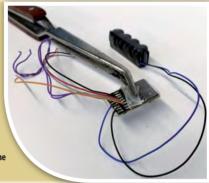


The next part of the puzzle is finding space for the Zimo MX648R sound decoder and as we have already seen, decoder space is limited. The Zimo decoder leaflet opens out and has a dear diagram showing the earth (ground) terminal on the decoder to which the black 'stay alive' wire then fits, and the blue wire goes to the terminal where the decoder's own blue wire originally went, or join it directly to the blue wire if you decided to leave it on.

The decoder will go in the underside of the bunker in the original decoder space but there isn't enough room to plug it in so the socket and its mounting bosses will need removing. Unscrew the socket plate and you will see it is attached electrically to four solder pads on the circuit board. Unsolder these wires from the lower board and lift them away with the socket attached. Cut or grind off the screw mounting bosses flush with the chassis to create space for the decoder to fit comfortably.

Preparing the decoder for hardwiring is the next stage and this could be the trickiest job. It is best to unsolder the unwanted cables from the decoder and then fit the new 'stay alive' wires to it. The connection points are accessible after trimming the sides of heatshrink covering enough to fold it badc it can be put back and secured with tape later to restore the insulation.





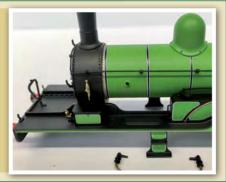


This leaves the two purple speaker wires and the track and motor wires in place on the decoder. Connect the speaker wires to those previously fitted in the body but avoid joining them where they run under the cab floor as they'll be too bulky to allow the body to sit level. Instead, join them further forwards in the boiler.



Cut the decoder feed and motor wires long enough to conveniently reach the solder pads on the chassis but short enough to avoid excess wire. Trim them to length then strip and tin the wires ready to attach directly to the solder points on the chassis board. A maximum of no more than 2mm of tinned wire needs to be exposed. The solder pads are labelled and the decoder wires fit onto as follows: TRR for the red wire, TRL for the black wire, M1 for the motor orange wire and M2 for the motor grey wire.

The body can now be rested upside-down in a service cradle or rested on a foam pad allowing the chassis to be dropped in for final fitting, but first remove the two small pipes at the front of the boiler on either side so they don't get trapped as the chassis and body go together. They are not glued in and they pull out and refit easily with tweezers.



The key thing to look for now is that the speaker wires align with the groove in the chassis for the existing wires under the cab floor. Note the purple speaker wires on the body already positioned to line up with the red and black wires in the locomotive chassis. Lay the body on its back and place the chassis into it checking all wires are tucked

neatly inside. You'll feel the chassis see sawing front to back if they aren't located correctly. It will probably take a couple of attempts to get them perfectly aligned.





You can now test your locomotive on address 3 without its cab and bunker parts refitted - these go on last when you're happy it's all working as it should. The 'stay alive' will take a few seconds to charge before its full effects are noticed but performance will be impressive and the sound will be dear and of high quality.

To finish off, carefully glue the cab backsheet to the roof panel first and when dry and rigid permanently glue the whole assembly back into place. Then refit the coal rails if required. Before refitting the coal moulding there are two locating tabs at its front edge that need trimming off to allow it to drop in over the 'stay alive'. Then glue the filler neck into the hole in the coal. I don't actually glue the coal into the bunker, instead I just place it in. That completes the installation and you'll have a reliable, sound fitted Adams' Radial Tank'.

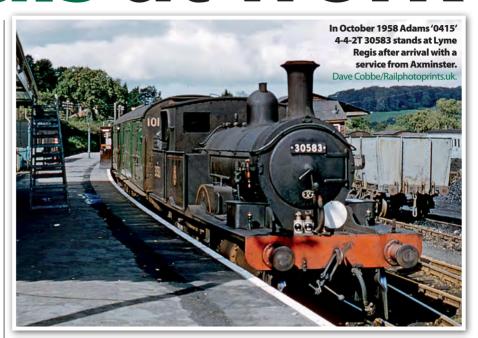
HE ADAMS '0415' 4-4-2Ts WERE originally built for London suburban passenger duties. The first were completed in 1882 and a total of 71 were built for the London and South Western Railway by outside contractors including Dubs. Neilson and Bever. Peacock.

With the arrival of the Drummond 'M7' 0-4-4Ts, the Adams Radials were relegated to branch line work and the majority had been withdrawn and scrapped by the 1920s. Only 30 of the fleet passed into Southern Railway ownership in 1923 but ultimately this reduced to just two operating on the steeply graded and twisting Lyme Regis branch line from Axminster. In 1946 a third was added with the purchase of 488 from the East Kent Railway which became 3488. Here the final Adams 4-4-2Ts saw out their careers with the Southern Railway and then British Railways - the last three in service being 30582, 30583 and 30584. These survived in service until 1961 and one, 30583 (formerly Southern Railway 3488) has been preserved on the Bluebell Railway in Sussex.

The arrival of the Oxford Rail and Hornby 'OO' gauge models of these sought after tank engines has presented new modelling opportunities and with the potential for a digital sound conversion their operational value can be increased greatly too.

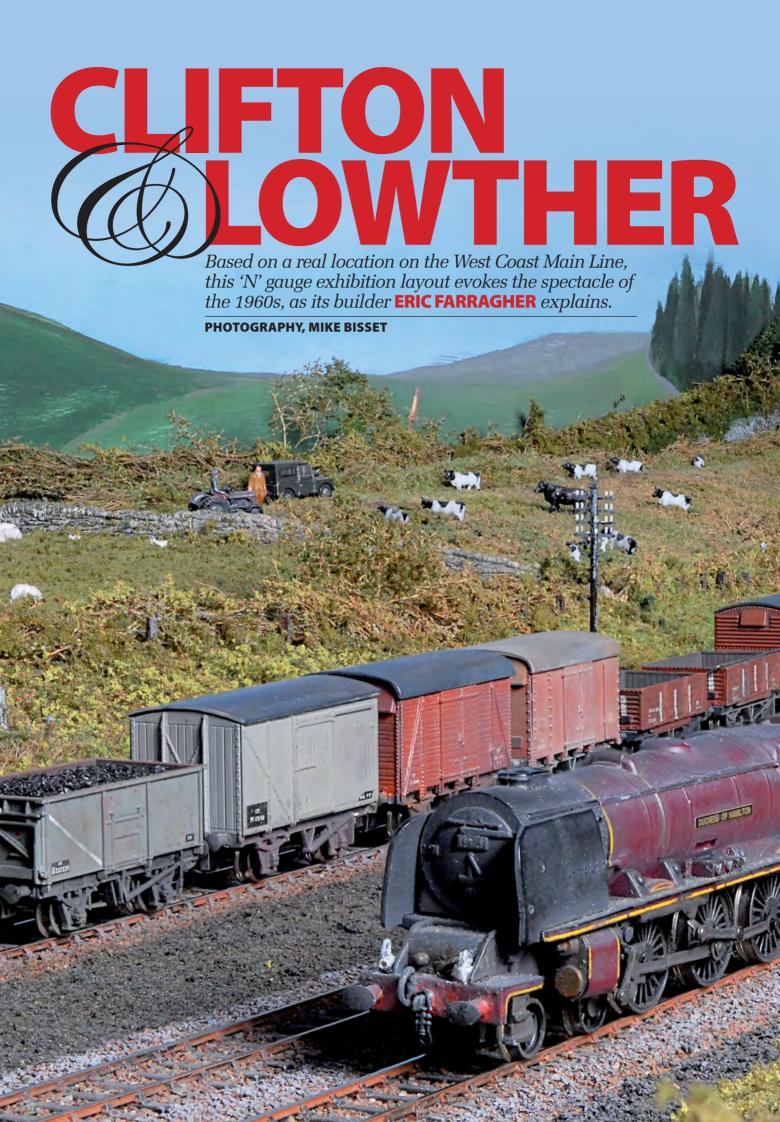

HIS model of Clifton and Lowther on the West Coast Main Line (WCML) came into being as a replacement for my previous 'N' gauge exhibition layout Hawes. A lot of time was spent considering what type of layout it should be - fictitious or prototype. Also I had to consider its size, features and operation.

My previous layout was based on the Settle and Carlisle line and used a bit of licence in its creation. The new layout would again be based on a real location, but this time it would be on the WCML which would enable use of the rolling stock from

Hawes. Set in the countryside, it would be a model for watching trains go by.

The design criteria called for a double track main line capable of running near scale length trains, a storage yard with enough space for a variety of trains, to be set in the 1950s/early 1960s so that it could utilise my existing collection and feature working semaphore signals. It also had to be simple to assemble and dismantle for use at exhibition.

Once I had decided that a real location was required it turned my thoughts to my trainspotting days which included regular visits to relatives who lived in the railway cottages at Clifton a few miles south of

Penrith in Cumbria. Standing on top of the banking behind those cottages watching all manner of trains pass on the West Coast Main Line created an everlasting impression that has survived to this day.

The station at Clifton and Lowther was opened in 1846 by the Lancaster and Carlisle Railway before becoming part of the London and North Western Railway (LNWR) network and the WCML from London to Glasgow. It was situated just south of Penrith. Although the station served the village of Clifton it was renamed Clifton and Lowther in 1878 after Clifton >>

Moor had been opened on the Eden Valley Railway's line over Stainmore to Penrith from Kirkby Stephen. The renamed station eventually closed to passengers in 1938 and freight in 1951.

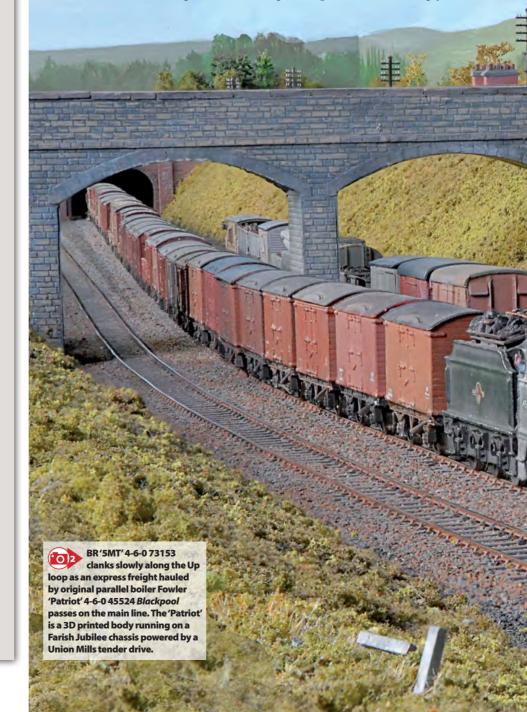
It was decided the model should be based on the area I remembered as I considered it to have some interesting features. Amongst these was a natural scenic break in the form of the bridge at the northern end (left hand side). This bridge had the Down Main passing through a single arch and the Up Main shared an arch with the Up Loop, whilst at the next bridge the Up and Down lines shared the same arch and the Up Loop a single arch. The line between the two bridges was in a cutting and the Clifton Down starter signal here shared a post with the Down distant for Eden Valley Junction, the next block section to the north.

After the second bridge the Up Loop starts to diverge slightly from the main line as it used to pass behind the Up platform. It then ran behind the signalbox where there is a signal controlling the exit on to the main line. The Up starter is

also adjacent to the signalbox. The line then passes under another road bridge which is fictitious and has been included to make a scenic break at the southern (right-hand) end of the scenic section.

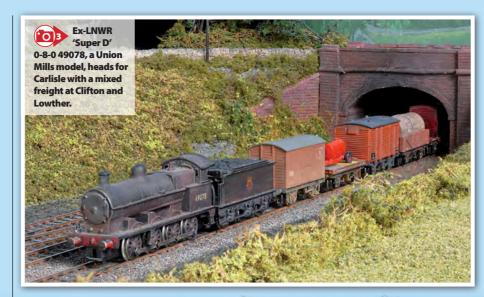
CONSTRUCTION

With some compression in length, this track layout could be accommodated on three baseboards, with three more baseboards for the storage yard and two end boards to join everything together giving an overall layout size of 16ft x 8ft with a central operating well. For transportation and storage when not in use the baseboards would be stored in two racks. The baseboards are all solid top boards constructed from 9mm plywood. The framework cross-members are 50mm x 18mm made by gluing two pieces of 9mm plywood together. The longitudinal members are again two pieces of 9mm plywood, but the internal piece is 50mm and the outside piece is 75mm. This arrangement produces a recess under the board to accommodate the fold up legs. The top is a single thickness of 9mm plywood.



The cross-members had holes drilled in them to accommodate the wiring. Each board has fold-up legs at one end only and is piggybacked off its neighbour. This requires a detachable leg for the first scenic and storage yard board to be erected. All the boards were sealed with varnish, to keep out moisture, before the tops and sides were painted. Pattern makers dowels and toggle catches, mounted on the sides of the baseboards, are used to fasten the boards together.

good appearance. The system is similar to the 2mm Scale Association's Easitrack system but with a gauge of 9mm capable of accepting modern 'N' gauge wheels. Older rolling stock will require replacement wheels fitting, an exercise I had to carry out myself on a number of my wagons.

After all the track had been laid,

including the fitting of the point motors, it was wired up by conventional means, thoroughly tested and then ballasted. The storage yard makes use of Peco code 55 track with

live frog points for speed of construction.

A total of 32 tracks were arranged in the off-scene storage yard to give four groups of eight loops across the three yard boards – two groups on the Up line (inside track) and two groups on the Down line (outside track).

The pointwork to provide access to each group of tracks was arranged on the end boards which were then classed as part of the storage yard. These boards also included other tracks and points (not used on Clifton and Lowther) to make the yard more universal for use on future layouts.

The point control for these loops involved the design and construction of eight diode matrix boards which enables a particular loop to be selected by pressing

the appropriate entrance and exit buttons.
Visual confirmation of the selected loop is provided by
LEDs worked from switches fitted to the point motors.
The point motors

also work a microswitch which sets the polarity of the point frog.

The end boards of the storage yard house the control panels (points and track feeds) for the Up (inner circuit) and Down (outer circuit) lines together with the sockets for the power inputs and DC controllers which are handheld. All electrical connections between base boards are made with multi-pin plugs and sockets.

SIGNALS

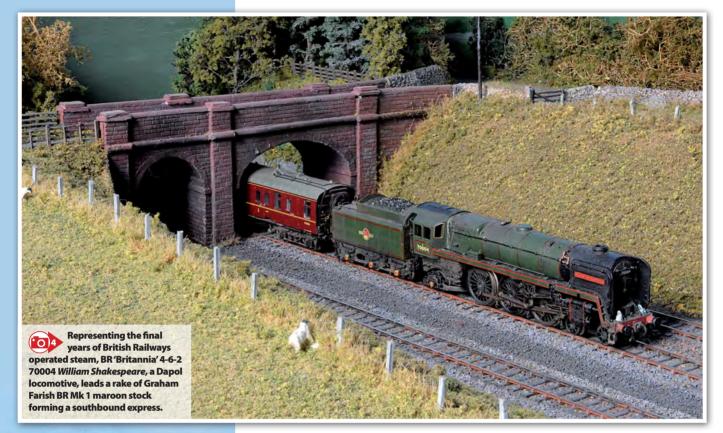
The layout is equipped with working semaphore signals which are made from copper tube for posts and MSE signal arms and they are powered by point motors which are connected by means of cranks and omega loops. This enables the throw of the point motor to be reduced and is also the method used to operate the finescale points.

Normally, the Down line signals are worked automatically by infra-red sensors at each end of the scenic section. A timer is used to delay the distant arm being raised. Both home and distant arms are reset together. The automatic system can be overridden and the signals operated manually by push buttons. On the Up line the signals are set manually as required (Up main or Up loop) and are then returned to danger by another infra-red sensor.

SCENERY

The ground contours were based on the prototype location as much as possible and were formed out of foam insulation boards, shaped and covered with filler before sealing and painting. Scatter materials

from the Woodland Scenics range were then fixed with PVA glue after fencing and walls had been installed. Trees and bushes were from varying sources, the most common being sea moss covered with scatter and foliage materials.

The signalbox and the cottages were scratch built using a mixture of card, plasticard, brick and slate papers, plastic and etched brass windows and doors. Both buildings are based on the originals but due to the lack of suitable photographs are mainly done from memory. The allotments on top of the banking at the rear of the cottages have been reduced in size to enable the lane at the front of the house to be included.

As the scenic work was progressing, my thoughts turned to some kind of working

feature to provide movement on the layout between the passage of trains. It was then that I discovered that the Faller Car System was available in 'N' gauge. A working roadway seemed to be the way forward.

The country lanes which form the roadway on the layout were incorporated into the scenery as it progressed. Being British countryside in the 1950s and 60s, thoughts turned to producing British outline road vehicles of the period. I had by then acquired some Faller N gauge lorries. I started to experiment by taking one to pieces to give me a bare chassis. Then by comparing the chassis with an Oxford Diecast Bedford pantechnicon, I found by careful trimming of the chassis and the body, the two would fit together. I now had my first working vehicle. Other vehicles

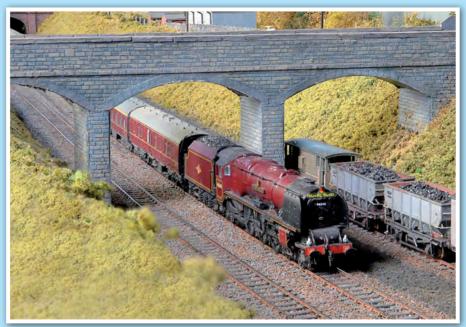
followed as more Faller chassis became available. The road system normally works automatically and requires three vehicles to make it work. There was some concern how the system would stand up to exhibition running conditions but to date other than an odd vehicle requiring recharging there have not been any real problems.

THE TRAINS

The rolling stock, which has been collected and built over a number of years, is a mixture of proprietary, kit built and modified items which have been weathered to various degrees. The locomotives are from Dapol, Graham Farish and Union Mills. Included in the fleet are classic WCML designs such as the Stanier 'Duchess' 4-6-2 and 'Black Five' 4-6-0 as well as earlier pre-grouping classes and BR Standards. All have had crews and lamps fitted. The locomotive collection represents most of the classes that ran on the line.

The rolling stock is made up into trains (complete with tail lamp) to represent the type and variety that ran on the WCML in that period - express and local passenger, parcels and all manner of goods trains including ballast and works trains take part in an exhibition running session. The main line sees a procession of trains in each direction including slower goods trains being held in the Up loop to allow the passage of faster trains.

Clifton and Lowther as a model I think has achieved what I set out to produce - namely a layout to watch

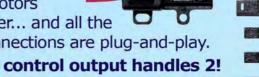

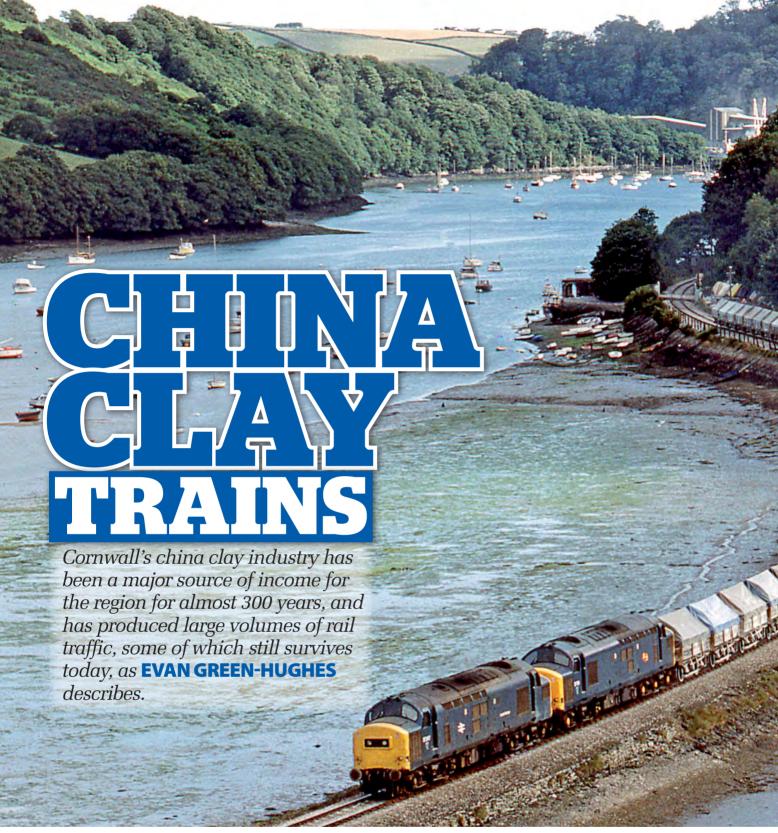

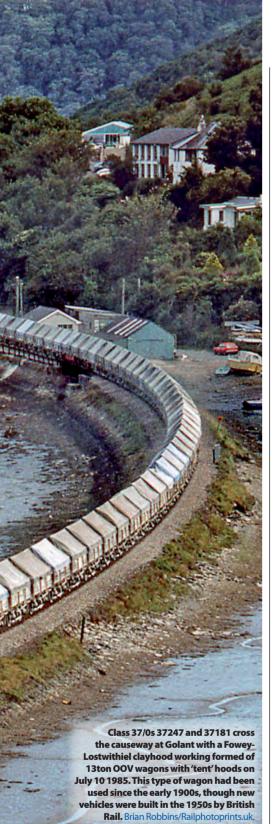
ENTION CORNISH freight trains to almost any enthusiast and their mind will immediately conjure up a vision of an idyllic branch line populated by strings of open wagons with their distinctive and instantly-recognisable canvas 'clay hoods'. Although these wagons have become extremely well-known they are in fact only a small part of the history of an operation which has seen millions of tons of product moved by rail for export to all corners of the world.

China clay, as the name suggests, is a material which was first used in China around 2,000 years ago to add a fine white colour to porcelain, and this was at a time when Europeans were still eating from crude earthenware plates or pieces of round wood. The material wasn't used in this country until the 18^{th} century when a chemist from Plymouth by the name of William Cookworthy began research into the process, for which he needed to find a supply of the raw material which would enable the whitening process to take place. Searching an ever-increasing area around his home he eventually stumbled upon a rare type of decomposed and extremely fine granite on a hill near Germoe in Cornwall which was then known as Growan Clay but which was later to become much better known as china clay.

It took Cookworthy a further 20 years to find a way to separate the material he required from the base rock but he eventually accomplished this by the use of water. His efforts paid off when he was able to establish the Plymouth Porcelain Factory in 1768, a firm which then began to produce fine china to sell to those rich enough to afford it.

Within 100 years china clay had become a substantial business in Cornwall as the deposits had been found to be the largest in the known world and as well as use in porcelain other uses began to be found for the material, including in the manufacture of paper and within the cosmetic and infant pharmaceutical industries. Thousands of

Cornishmen were employed in the industry, often working in poor conditions, which were particularly bad for those working in the pits where jets of water were used to dislodge the clay from the walls.

China clay production spurred on the construction of some very large quarries, and also the dries that went with them where the material was processed - but it also generated the building of a number of harbours from which product could be moved by ship, which included that at Charlestown, near St Austell. It quickly transformed from a tiny hamlet with a population in single figures to a major facility housing no fewer than 3,000 people to work in the china clay industry.

CLAY BY RAIL

As might have been expected, expansion of the industry was heavily dependent on the ability to transport product from the quarry to the coast, which while not a great distance as the crow flies presented considerable difficulties from a logistical point of view due to the hilly nature of the local terrain. Inevitably once technology permitted it railways began to be constructed to fulfil this need with the first system being promoted by J.T. Jeffry in 1847. His first line ran from Ponts Mill, a mile north of St Blazey, to Bugle Mollins and served the Wheal Virgin copper mine, which was at this time producing some 750tons of ore a

year. This was later extended to Par Harbour, also constructed by Jeffry, and was joined by a similar horse-worked enterprise serving Newquay Harbour eight years later. Several of his lines served the china clay industry. In 1873 Jeffry's railways were taken over by a speculator called Roebuck who incorporated them into the Cornwall Minerals Railway, a system that extended for over 40 miles, and which was worked with locomotives. By this time the Great Western was well established in the county but the two systems were not physically connected because the GWR was broad gauge at that time and Roebuck's system standard. In fact the Act of Parliament which allowed the mineral railways to be constructed ha

laid down that dual gauge tracks should be provided but what work was done to this end was done in such a fashion that the broad gauge tracks could not be used and materials therefore had to be transshipped at places such as Drinnick Mill.

Inevitably as time went on independent lines in Cornwall became the property of the all-conquering Great Western Railway, including the Cornwall Mineral Railway which was purchased in 1896. Its main line, from Par to Newquay, is still in use today as part of the national network. One interesting remnant of this arrangement was that Par Harbour retained its own tracks, introducing steam locomotives in 1912 and using them until 1977, the last two being low-height Bagnall 0-4-0STs Judy and Alfred which were the inspiration for Bill and Ben in the 'Thomas' books and both of which are now preserved.

WAGON DESIGNS

Both the private owners and the Great Western standardised on the same type of wagon, which was a five-plank open fitted with side doors and which had an end door used when tipping china clay into ships or storage areas. Large numbers of these were built at the turn of the century but production ceased around 1914 with few built there after. British Railway began a gradual replacement programme in 1954

which saw more than 100 new wagons built each year until production ceased in 1960. These were the famous OOV wagons, and all but the first batch were fitted with the vacuum brake. Around 80% were also fitted with steel hoops across the top over which were draped canvas sheets designed to keep moisture off the contents, something which had been requested by the china clay industry for many years before that.

Although these wagons lasted until 1988, they were used throughout a time when the railways were a byword for inefficiency. There were numerous complaints about the way that china clay traffic was worked and in particular the time it took each train to travel from the dries to the port, and also the lack of capacity on each train, something that was not helped by the fact that each wagon held only 13tons, a figure that had remained unchanged for a century.

Perhaps because of impatience with the railways or perhaps as a result of the general increase in the use of road transport agreement was reached in 1966 between British Railways and English China Clay

to convert one of the two rail lines into Fowey into a road, thus giving road access to the port for the first time ever. This was thought to be essential for the survival of the industry because the other suitable deep sea port, Par, was worked to capacity at this time. agreement that 500,000tons of china clay would continue to flow into the port by rail each year and also that much of the domestic traffic, to places such as Stoke, would continue to be moved by train.

The future of the traffic came to a head again in the 1980s when the OOV wagons were worn-out. The customer, by now English China Clay (ECC), did not want to provide its own wagons and instead signed a 15 year deal to move traffic by rail. This encouraged BR to invest in a fleet of 124 CDA wagons which were air braked and which had a capacity of 32tons. Similar to the Merry-Go-Round coal wagons then in production but fitted with a steel top cover, these were built at Doncaster. The last train of 'hoods' ran, hauled by a Class 37, in February 1988.

As part of the deal six dedicated Class 37/5s moved to Cornwall and St Blazey

depot was modernised to cope with them. Prior to this date Class 22s, 25s and even Class 47s could be found on the traffic as well as the Class 37s. The new wagons ran in silver livery with ECC branding until the privatisation of the railways when they acquired EWS colours.

BULK TRANSPORT

Although the four-wheelers were adequate for transporting the majority of china clay which was destined for export by ship some was exported by rail and to cope with this traffic bogie 'Polybulk' wagons were introduced from 1974 onwards. These were initially used on a weekly service to Biberist in Switzerland and later on a new service to Mossend in Scotland.

Unfortunately, as with many other industries, china clay has suffered a slow decline over the last 60 years or so.

Substantial deposits of similar material discovered in Brazil which can be mined at a fraction of the cost of the domestic product has led to many sites being closed down, and much of the infrastructure is now mothballed or disused. Some traffic does continue to run, however, with a typical example being that which runs from Goonbarrow Junction on the Newquay branch to Fowey Dock and which runs as required on a weekday and takes one and a half hours to cover a distance of only 12 miles or so as the crow flies. This is worked by DB Schenker, as successor to EWS, using Class 66s. Interestingly, this still uses the CDAs which are by now just as venerable a design as the OOV was in its day.

In model form for 'OO' we are fortunate that the early sheeted wagons have been produced in ready-to-run format as well as the 'hooded' variant – both by Bachmann.

Hornby offers the post 1988 CDA while Dapol has produced the modern 'Silver Bullet' high capacity tanker. Bachmann has produced the Polybulk while Kernow Model Rail Centre has produced high capacity PBA and JIA bogie covered wagons while it is now working on a new model of the small batch of PRA four-wheel wagons built in the 1980s, again for 'OO' gauge.

Although the time when a Great
Western 'Pannier' or 'Prairie' could be
seen towing a rake of covered wagons
through beautiful, but perhaps whitestained, countryside are now long gone
it is pleasing that at least some china
clay traffic continues to be railborne and
that what there is uses interesting and
increasingly rare rolling stock. It is to be
hoped that despite competition from other
parts of the world this traffic continues to
flow for many years in the future.

STATT PROJECTS

RECYCLED

Recycling is an important part of daily life, and rather than building from scratch we've been reinventing the *Hornby Magazine* layout roster to create new scenes. **MIKE WILD** introduces West Coast Cement ahead of its debut at the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition on November 24/25.

T'S WAS LIKE a moment from Blue Peter when we started work on West Coast Cement – "Here's one we made earlier!" was in our heads as we brought out the cement works. The initial phase is a remake of the cement works board built for Shortley Bridge and Felton Cement Works, but in fact the result is that the four scenic boards are all recycled from that 'OO' gauge layout including the original station and two of the storage yard corner sections.

Having stripped it all down earlier this year for the catenary installation feature for HM132 we felt like the hard work was done - after all, more than a quarter of the scenery was already complete and we'd laid a main line through the first 12ft section. We were quite wrong though and after the intensive build to extend Grosvenor Square for the Great Electric Train Show (HM136) and several other projects we were straight back in the workshop in early September with a four-week build period to complete West Coast Cement's scenic section for the Hornby Magazine Yearbook.

And that we did, but now as I type at the end of October we have just over three weeks in which to build a brand new 20ft long storage yard to go with it which we will use for future layouts too. The clock is ticking, the track is here, the points have been recovered from Shortley Bridge... but we still need to get started on the timber work.

ERA CHANGE

All that though is by the by – and it will all be ready in time for when doors open at the NEC on November 24/25. West Coast Cement is something different for the magazine as it is set in the 1995-2005 period and models a

fictional stretch of the northern section of the West Coast Main Line. It consists of a double track main line at the front, plus a goods loop, with a cement works and exchange sidings behind. It has automatic four-aspect colour light signals, concrete sleeper track, a dual carriageway crossing on a concrete bridge and a level crossing at the other end with Train-Tech working lights added to Wills' recent modern level crossing kit. It is a busy scene and

one which we have thoroughly enjoyed putting together.

The cement works backdrop adds valuable operational value to a layout which is actually very simple when it comes to the main lines. The outer circuit is literally just that – a circuit of plain track connected to a series of storage loops in the rear yard. The inner circuit is only slightly more complicated in the scenic area as it includes a goods loop joining the main line halfway along the frontage. The

cement works is almost entirely independent – particularly in terms of the scenic section – but it does link to the main line in the off-scene areas. This is a layout to watch trains go by, but with the added value of shunting operations.

We're expecting to need two operators at a time on the layout – one to run the cement works with its shunting sequences and one to operate the pair of main lines. We've planned for one operator on the main line so that they

don't become too busy – easily done with a layout like this.

We are currently finalising the trackplan for the storage yard, but we expect it to have 3ft wide baseboards with up to 15 tracks across. The centre road is planned to be a reversing line allowing cement trains to make complex movements around the layout to enhance the operational and viewing experience while the

rest of the roads, seven in each direction, will feed to the two main line circuits. We will be keeping the exits as simple as possible to allow the yard to be paired with new frontages in the future.

NEW FLEET

Alongside development of the layout we've been working hard to develop the rolling stock for it too as none of our existing exhibition

fleets suit the chosen period for West Coast Cement. This includes classes 08, 31, 37, 43, 47, 56, 57, 60, 66, 67, 86, 87, 90, 150, 153, 221 and 390 with multiples of some classes – particularly Class 37s which both Mark and I seem to have a lot of! There are bound to be interlopers too – both of us have a soft spot for Class 58s even though they didn't work on the WCML – so one or two locomotives

which we like because of what they are will doubtless appear too.

There is plenty still to do on the rolling stock front including sound fitting the final locomotives, weathering and finalising of the freight formations. We might not have all of that done in time for its first show at the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition, but we'll give it a good go. See you there!

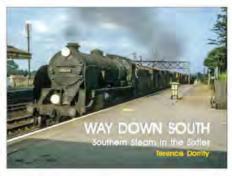
The Book of the KING 4-6-0s

The Kings were the final development of the Churchward four-cylinder Churchward four-cylinder 4-6-0, stretched to the very limits of the loading gauge. Many people have asked why this, the premier Great Western Railway express passenger class, had not been covered in the 'Book of series when books had been devoted to the humble

or' series when books had been devoted to the humble pannier tanks and the 'lesser' 4-6-0 classes. The answer lies partly in the mists of time in the previous millennium when Irwell Press published Peto's Register on the Kings in 1995. Although it has stood the test of time quite well, it was thought the material should be dusted down, refurbished and re-invigorated with a generous helping of new pictures to take its rightful place at the head of the GWR 'Books of'. The Chairman of the Great Western wanted the most powerful express engines in the country, and the successors to the Castle were designed to achieve this. His publicity department, never shy of trumpeting the company to the outside world, took full advantage of its new engines and pressed its claim, both at home and to the world via a trip to the USA. They even produced a book titled The 'King' of Railway Locomotives and details taken from several of its chapters have been included as a fascinating contemporary account of the of the building of the engines. As befits their status, the Kings attracted much attention from the enthusiast community from first to last, and many column inches have been devoted to their workings in both contemporary and historical journals and magazines.





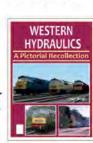

The pictures show an IRDOT-1 infra red detector. This is used for locating trains in hidden sidings and fiddleyards. The IRDOT board fits beneath the baseboard with the infra red detector and emitter (black "tubes" shown in the right hand picture) fitting in a hole between the sleepers. The infra red beam is reflected from the underside of (unmodified) rolling stock.
