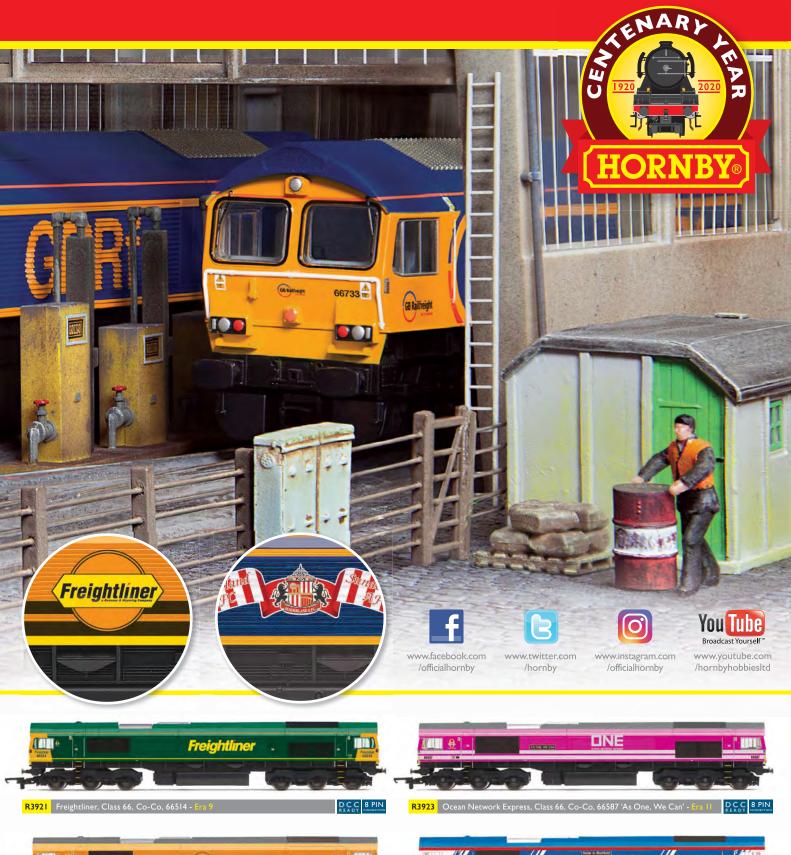

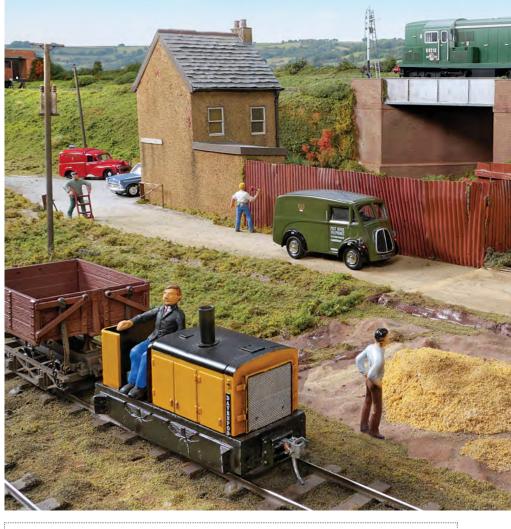

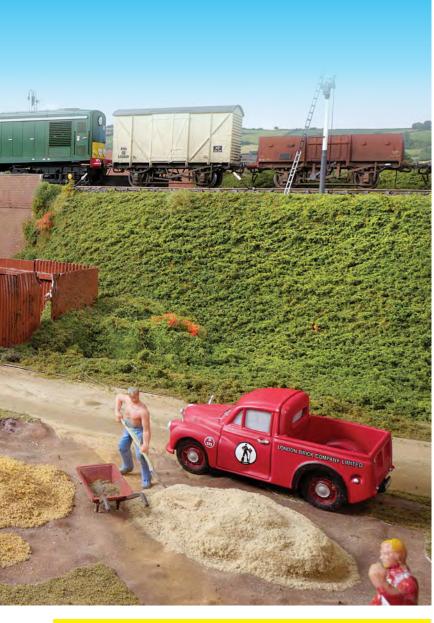

## HORNBY'2MT'2-6-0 FIRST SAMPLE SURFACES



ORNBY took delivery of the first engineering sample of its forthcoming 'OO' gauge BR Standard '2MT' 2-6-0 in late February for evaluation.

65 of these Riddles-designed locomotives were built at Darlington in the 1950s, with examples shared across BR's Western, Midland, Eastern and Scottish Regions.

First announced in January, Hornby's new model will appear as 78010 in BR lined black with early crests (Cat No. R3838), 78047 in BR lined black with late crests (R3836) and 78000 in BR green with late crests (R3839). The impressive specification includes a diecast locomotive boiler and chassis, five-pole skew wound motor, eight-pin Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder socket, space for a 28mm diameter speaker, metal buffers, separately applied handrails and more.

Priced at £179.99 each, delivery is anticipated in late 2020/early 2021.

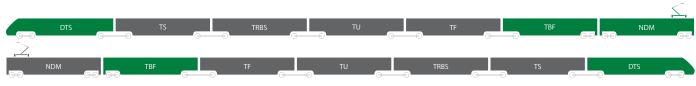

Hornby has issued a useful set of graphics to confirm the intended formations of its forthcoming 'OO' gauge models of BR's Class 370 Advanced Passenger Train Prototype.

A five-car pack of 370003/004 (Cat No. R3873) and a seven-car pack of 370001/002 (R3874)

are currently planned with additional trailer vehicle twin packs offered to complete prototypical sets of up to 14 vehicles in the respective early (plain yellow front) and later (black windshield) APT livery. Sufficient twin-packs of trailers (R40011/40012/40013/40014)

will be available together with an additional motorised Non Driving Motor (NDM) vehicle (R3948) to complete unit 370003/370004, while trailer car twin-packs R40011A/R40012A/R40013A/R40014A to form a 14-car 370001/370002, which also features both a

motorised and a dummy NDM vehicle, are also planned. Whilst R3874 also comes with the APT-U Development vehicle included, this can be removed from the formation if developing a full 14 car set.

locomotives all model Class 37/4s
which are currently running on
the national network in a variety
of colour schemes which haven't
been modelled before accurately.

The fleet of 31 refurbished Class 37/4s was completed at Crewe Works in 1985-1986 with the most significant upgrade being the addition of Electric Train Heat (ETH) to allow them to work with more modern coaching stock. Withdrawals through DB Schenker started in the late 2000s, but Direct Rail Services acquired 13 engines to join its existing two and rebuilt eight for further use.

The DRS overhauled locomotives have a number of detail differences which haven't been modelled before including 37423 which is unique in the sub-class for having WIPAC light clusters, a cab top headlight, nose end multiple working sockets and numerous other details. All this is being modelled by Accurascale for its version of 37423 Spirit of the Lakes in DRS Compass livery. It will be joined by models of DRS operated 37409 Lord Hinton in BR large logo blue, 37419 Carl Haviland 1954-2012 in InterCity Mainline colours and 37425 Sir Robert McAlpine in Regional Railways colours. These locomotives will also feature unique details including large LED taillights and plated bodyside windows.

The specification for the new Class 37/4s matches that announced for the previous Class 37/0 and 37/6 sub-classes with a choice of

DCC ready and DCC sound fitted formats – the latter with a twin speaker set up and ESU LokSound V5 decoder. The drive systems will consist of a centrally mounted five-pole motor, all-wheel drive, helical gearing, accurate lighting, stay-alive power pack and a die-cast chassis for weight. Prices are set at £169.99 DCC ready and £259.99 DCC sound fitted. Delivery is due in early 2021 and models can be ordered direct from Accurascale and its stockists. 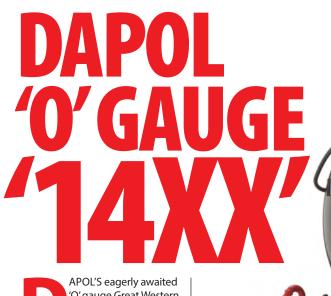

Dapol's latest'O' gauge wagon features separately applied details, individual side doors, stanchions, diecast metal chassis, sprung buffers and more. Six models are expected – three in 'Dutch' yellow and grey as DB978337/DB978407/ DB978702 (Cat Nos. 7F-043-004/005/006) and three in EWS maroon as DB978363/DB978396/ DB978309 (7F-043-001/002/003). Prices are set at £69.95 each.

A new batch of ready-to-run Mk 1 General Utility Vans (GUVs) has been announced by Heljan for 'O' gauge as part of its relaunch of the Mk 1 carriage range.

This will be the second production run of these all-purpose parcels vans and this new batch will feature new liveries and weathered finishes. Each vehicle will have working screwlink couplings as standard. Planned for release are versions

in BR maroon (Cat No. 4991), BR maroon with a weathered finish (4991A), BR blue (4992), weathered BR blue (4992A), BR blue with Express Parcels branding (4993), BR blue and grey with Motorail branding (4995), InterCity livery with Motorail branding (4996) and Network SouthEast colours (4997).

Prices are set at £199 for pristine examples and £215 for weathered versions. A release date is to be confirmed.

Rails of Sheffield expands wagon range

Rails of Sheffield is producing a second version of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway (SECR) 16ft covered goods wagon in partnership with Dapol. The 'OO' gauge ready-to-run model will follow on from the successes of its first batch of Diagram 1424 box vans by offering the earlier version in SECR and Southern Railway colour schemes.

The wagons were introduced in 1904 with 110 being built over the next four years. Most were equipped with Hill's brake gear which had brakes on one side of the wagon only together with levers to apply them on each side. Rails' model will have this type of braking system modelled together with the Eros vents.

Liveries selected cover SECR light grey as built, SECR dark grey applied from 1917 and SR brown which the vans carried between 1923 and 1936. In addition, a version will be

offered with experimental pressed steel doors, only two wagons had this modification, in early SECR grey. The Rails SECR box vans are being designed and produced solely in the UK using modern technology to allow short runs of these wagons. Prices are set at £32.99 and the full range of wagon identities can be seen at www.railsofsheffield.com.

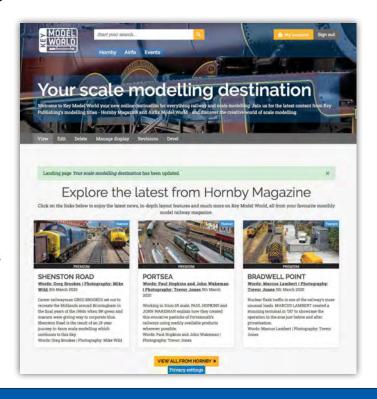

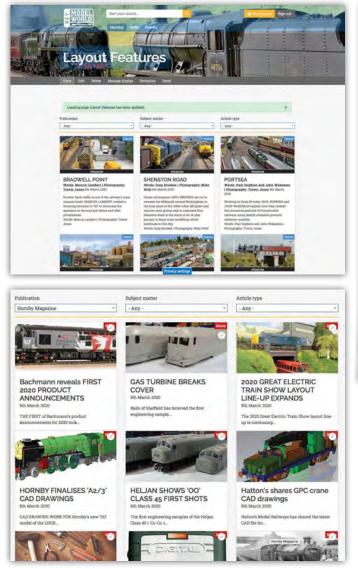

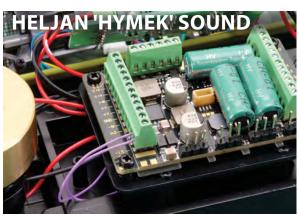

#### PAINT EASY THE HARDER WAY

## It is almost 30 years since RON BAILES embarked on the creation of this Order operation. He explains how

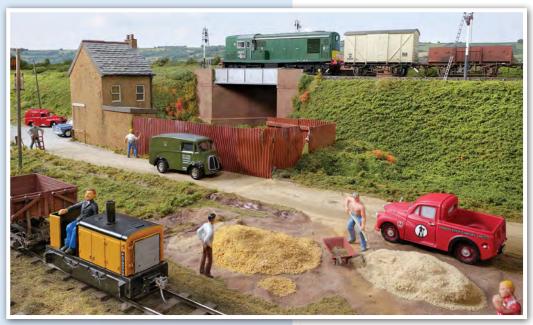
layout which combines standard and narrow gauge operation. He explains how it has tripled in length from the original design to deliver an impressive 36ft long exhibition model of an East Anglian brick works.

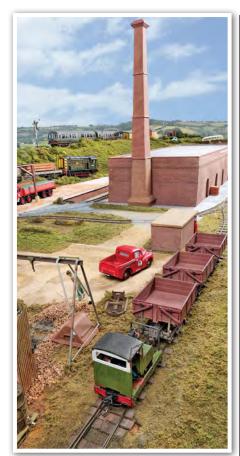


HERRY ORCHARD is the culmination of 25 years of modelling. It started in 1990 with the acquisition of a set of baseboards measuring 12ft x 2ft and has since grown to a total of 36ft x 4ft while also encompassing the addition of standard gauge to the original narrow gauge scene.

I have been working on the railways since 1974. Having held a number of posts over the years, the most enjoyable was as a secondman at King's Cross from 1980 to 1983. I still drive trains today, but on the Swindon and Cricklade Railway.

During 1990 my current layout, Ronsthorpe, was nearing completion and a new project was being considered. At the time the Western Model Railway Society was looking to reduce the number of projects within the society and so a part-built 'O-16.5' narrow gauge layout of 12ft x 2ft came my way. 'O-16.5' uses 16.5mm track with 7mm scale locomotives and rolling stock to represent narrow gauge railway operations. The original aim when I took ownership of the baseboards was to remove the trackwork and build a new 'N' gauge layout on the baseboards. However, a visit to a show in Swindon revealed some of the new narrow-gauge locomotive kits in 'O-16.5' based on items at the Stevington and Turvey Light Railway. A visit to the brick works at Cherry Orchard, which had a narrow gauge railway, and another at Star Lane provided the inspiration for the layout and the die was cast for a new narrow gauge layout in 7mm scale.

This first phase focused purely on narrow gauge operation. The 12ft x 2ft area was made up from three 4ft x 2ft baseboards and I soon realised that I could reuse the track on the first boards meaning that I had only one board to complete. This was done with Peco code 100 narrow gauge track, but I replaced the rails with code 75 to bring it into line with the original track. Control was via analogue using Gaugemaster handheld units while point switching >>>



A Simplex 4wDM takes a trio of waste wagons past the narrow gauge engine shed with the kiln and brick loading dock in the distance. The shunter is heading towards the lower yard on the bottom of the incline. The kiln board was first shown at Dortmund in Germany and extended the narrow-gauge layout to 16ft.

Cherry Orchard Lane with a narrow gauge train passing over the level crossing on its way to the pressing shed. On the main line an English Electric 350hp shunter shunts an ex-LMS 20ton brake van into the exchange sidings. While the layout is not a true model of Cherry Orchard brickworks, the house and entrance to the works is based on actual buildings at Cherry Orchard.

was actuated by H&M motors.

The scenery is made from using the chicken wire and plaster bandage method which was then covered with Artex. This is then formed into the details of the landscape as it was laid. Once it had dried, it was painted with a mixture of water and acrylic colours. The buildings are made from foamboard covered with modeller's clay. This was then scribed to form the brickwork - a lengthy process but well worth it. Details were added from the photographs taken at Star Lane and Cherry Orchard which gave the layout the look that I was trying to achieve. Indeed, the road name is made from an actual photograph of the street name at the location.

The railway runs from the clay mound across old workings to the pressing shed, where the clay is then unloaded and turned into bricks. The locomotive shed is next to the pressing shed with the works offices nearby. At the clay mound a modified Corgi Priestman Club shovel was used to load the skip wagons via a loading hopper. The clay then gets worked to the pressing shed where the skip wagons are then unloaded. Locomotives are kits of the types used on narrow gauge railways: Ruston, Simplex and Orenstein and Koppel with skip wagons built from

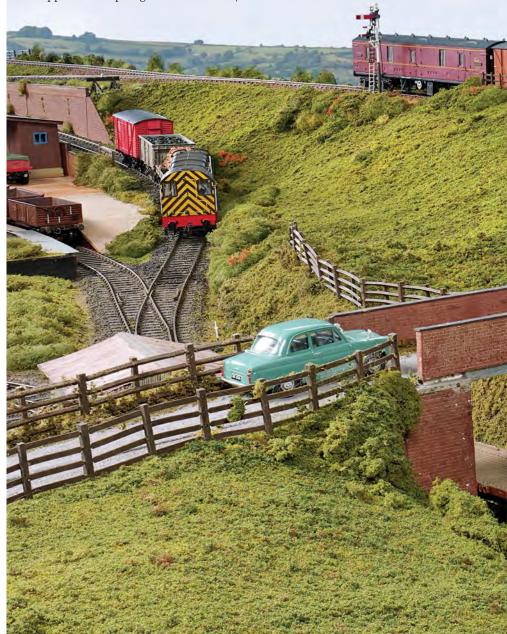
Wrightlines kits. Some other wagons were converted to an engineer's train and a wagon for fuel for the digger.

While the layout was complete, plans were already afoot to add a kiln, standard gauge sidings and at some stage in the future a standard gauge feeder to a mainline. This would enable the layout to depict the brick making process from dug clay to the finished bricks being transported away on the standard gauge feeder.

#### THE FIRST EXTENSION

I worked on the plan to add a standard gauge aspect to the layout. This involved adding a kiln with standard gauge loading sidings followed by the connections and a small engine shed based on the one at Winchester (SR). To start with this involved adding another two 4ft boards to the layout making it 20ft long. The first board included the kiln building with its own narrow gauge track and two standard gauge sidings either side. The kiln area is based on the brickworks at Stewartby, not far from where I live.

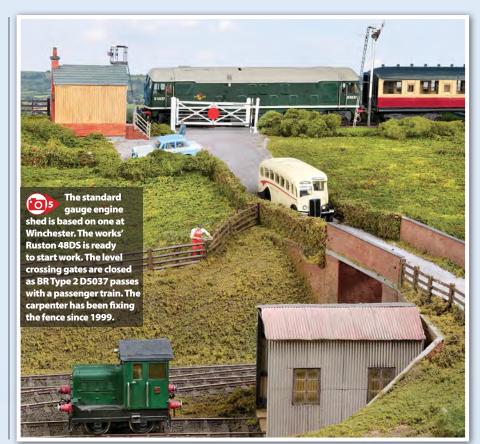
The second board contained the pointwork and engine shed, and I also laid in the future connection to the standard gauge feeder line. The aim at that time was to have the final board



as a 4ft long storage yard. This actually meant that the layout would be 24ft long, so you can see how it had started to grow. The standard gauge track work is Peco laid on a cork bed, scenery being constructed as before. The engine shed was built using aluminium corrugated sheet on a balsawood framework. Again, the points were powered by H&M point motors and control was built into the existing control panel, which was built to allow the planned extensions. Control of the track sections were added to the cab control of the original layout.

The first 'O' gauge locomotive kit I built was a little Ruston 48DS 4wDM and some Slaters 'O' gauge wagon kits. BR built a batch of high bar wagons for brick trains out of Culvert brickworks, so I based my brick traffic wagons on those. In order to make the high bar work correctly, I used two sets of castings, modifying them to allow the high bar to swing over to either side of the wagon when not in use, as per the prototype. Later I built a Fowler 0-4-0 locomotive kit based on those used by British Leyland at the Pressed Steel Fisher works in Swindon.

I was asked to show the layout at Swindon, my hometown, and as the storage yard was not built yet I used a suitable length of wood held in place by)





clamps to the layout and a tripod at the outer end with a single line of track.

At this time, the Western MRS had just invested in the Lenz Digital Control system. This system looked to be the future of model railway control and so I invested in the then new Compact system by Lenz to begin my journey in digital. Both my locomotives were fitted ready for the Swindon show and the Lenz system was first used at the exhibition. The workings of this system were interesting to both us as operators as well as the public. Having got this far the layout, at 24ft x 2ft and now including a storage area and small goods yard, was invited to several shows and ran very well. However, I had ideas to get on and build the standard gauge feeder, but this was still a distant dream, including the rolling stock required to run it.

#### **THE FEEDER**

The first step for creating the mainline was construction of the rolling stock. With the Eastern Region theme I looked into suitable prototypes and decided that wagons would be from Slaters kits while the first locomotive would be a Steve Beattie kit for a Class 15 Bo-Bo diesel. A two-car DMU was needed and fortunately while visiting Derby depot I was talking with one of the drivers who was thinking of selling a Class 101 DMU which fitted my requirements.

Construction of what turned out to be a 36ft extension to the back of the layout, making the layout 36ft x 4ft when fully erected, then started. The standard gauge feeder would be a single line with an off-scene yard at each end, a station at one end of the layout and two exchange sidings with a headshunt. The connection between the brickworks and exchange sidings would be via an incline as the mainline section of the layout was to be 4in higher than the front section. This was to allow the old narrow gauge layout to run underneath in order to swap the loaded and empty skip wagons.

It soon became clear that the work involved was going to take some time and took ages to get all the woodwork to such a stage that we could start laying the track. Having decided the final layout of the trackwork we hit our first problem. In order to fit the sidings and incline in, we needed a double slip and as Peco's ready-made product wasn't available at the time Stuart Prentice rapidly assembled a C&L kit for the purpose.

Scenery was made in the same way using chicken wire to cover the open framework. The narrow gauge was extended to run around the back of the layout but would mean that the working digger at the front was now redundant and so was taken off, but I decided to leave the hopper in place, which looking at the prototype was common. I had reached a point where the layout was all coming together and would be ready to display. Brighton Model World invited us and so we now had our next target date to get the layout ready.



The area in front of the right-hand storage yard has been enhanced with the addition of a Brewery yard. The Drewry 204hp (Class 04) is shunting the yard today. All the wagons in the yard are kit built – now you can buy most of these ready-made!

#### **LESSONS LEARNT**

In February 2003 we took the layout to Brighton, its first show in the new format. The storage yard at the siding end was a four-road sector plate and at the station end of the layout we used cassettes made from aluminium L section screwed to MDF. Control of the layout was still by the Compact unit by Lenz with the narrow gauge still running under analogue cab control. While the layout was complete, the scenery at one end was not, and a grass mat was used to finish this section. On the rolling stock side, the Class 15 was finished, but unpainted and the DMU was in unlined green. The show opened on the Saturday and we started what turned out to be an interesting weekend.

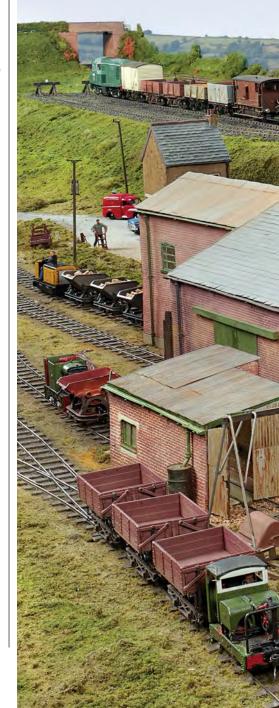
While the narrow gauge ran well, the wagons kept coming uncoupled under the rear of the layout. The 'O' gauge was running well, but we had problems with reliability of the point motors for the double slip. To compound matters we were losing control of the layout on the DCC side which in turn started to affect the point motors.

The DCC system we had chosen wasn't powerful enough to deliver all of what we needed so, after the Brighton show, the Lenz 100 system was bought as an upgrade, together with a power booster and higher amperage transformer. The point modules were replaced and the two burnt out point motors replaced.

I was invited to South West Herts show in April 2004, but I had underestimated the amount of rolling stock needed. I arranged to borrow some suitable stock until I had what I needed which has included the addition of a DJH Class 31 kit and ready-to-run Class 03 from the same source.

#### **LAYOUT COMPLETE**

The layout had by 2005 been completed and went to the Bremen show in Germany that year. New point motors and modules were fine, and the new rolling stock was also running well. However, there was more point motor trouble so I decided



to rewire the DCC side of the layout, fit better point modules and use SEEP point motors. The mains units for the DCC were also changed to give more amps.

During the rest between shows, I had ordered a Just Like The Real Thing Class 24 kit and a Brassworks Class 08 shunter. My aim was to have them both ready for Tolworth, but in the end I ran out of time and patience with both and they ended up in the drawer until I had more time to understand where I was going wrong.

Tolworth Showtrain was attended in November 2007. By this time the layout was running well but had still not completed a show with the layout working at the end of it. More point motor trouble occurred and I made the decision to fit Tortoise motors. This was a 'Eureka!' moment and the fitting and operation thereafter was fantastic. After this show the full set of point motors were replaced with Tortoise slow-action types.

Just after Christmas 2007, I received an invite to attend Oldenburg in February 2008. This was the layout's third trip abroad and the second with the full layout. Work on my two locomotives was restarted with the aim to finish them by the show date. The Brassworks Class 08 only needed some details added and painting. I was pleased with the result so decided to push ahead and finish the Class 24. This involved removing all the old paintwork and starting again. Well this time all went well, and it was ready one night before we set off for Germany.

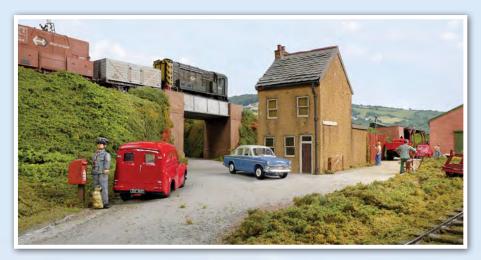
The layout went up well and the points all worked fine for the whole weekend.

It was decided after Oldenburg to change the goods yard area at the front of the layout, extending it by another 4ft, but not extending the overall length of the layout. Now the layout had 13 4ft x 2ft baseboards with 6ft fiddle yards at each end.

The 2009 St Albans show came and went with no major incidents and with the layout running well. Being placed at the back of the stage helped the soundfitted engines, which could be heard along the length of the layout with ease above the noise of the show. The new goods yard looked good and ran well. Stuart had purchased a new Brassworks Class 04 ready painted. The sound unit on this model was fitted with a 100ohms bass reflex speaker, which worked very well. Running on the narrow gauge was improved by the purchase of and modification of Bachmann Spectrum 0-4-0 diesels and their V-dump skips, which provided us with automatic uncoupling.

With an invite for Trainwest at Melksham in April 2010 coming up, a new traverser was built for the station end of the layout. Up to now I had used cassettes, but I found the traverser method better for the scale being

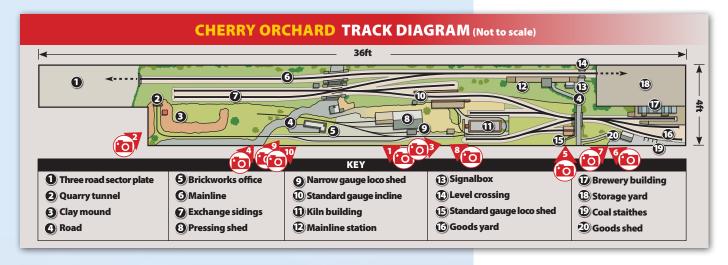


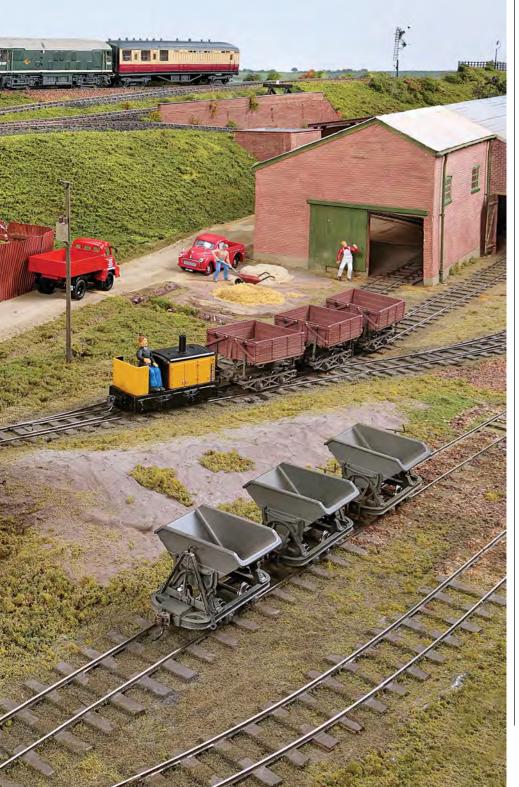

used. I had purchased a Heljan Class 20, which was a little out of place for the area modelled but correct for the period, and it was new. On the Sunday we found a stand with an 'O' gauge Class 20 sound unit which was later fitted by Stuart in record time to bring it into service with sound after lunch.

A few weeks into the New Year an invite was confirmed for the Warley Show at the NEC in 2011. The layout needed some signals and working level crossing gates. While the first signal was built, it needed to be fitted. The signal went in with no problems and was worked from a Tortoise motor. The level crossing gates are operated by Servo motors.

#### RECENT DEVELOPMENT

The Warley Show seems a long time ago now, but it was an interesting two days, not without its problems. The layout over the years has visited many shows up and down the country and it seems we have passed several years without any work being done to the layout very quickly. So now that the layout can be stored and exhibited without having to repair it after every show we have time to sort the rolling stock.

However, the days of always kit building in 'O' gauge are now long gone since the increase in ready-to-run rolling stock. With more locomotives, coaches and wagons becoming available each year, this has made 'O' gauge similar to 'OO' gauge, only needing to build kits for the odd wagon or coach as required. Also, sound chips have made some substantial changes from basic to those that now have braking built in and stay alive fitted. My Ruston 48DS has not run for more than 10 years – but now fitted with sound and stay alive it is just unbelievable the difference from when I first built it.

Having started this project in 1993 and with it still going is it worth all the time and money? I think so, having enjoyed the building of the layout, the fun and meeting different people over the years. You may wonder why it has taken so long? I am involved with many other interests, and of course I need to work for a living as well. So, while it has taken 27 years so far, I don't see it ending soon.

## The dark, mysterious world of cross-country postal traffic is something that's rarely modelled. TIM SHACKLETON explores the possibilities.

LOVE being close to the railway at night – my imagination runs riot and almost anything becomes possible. Despite my obsession with detail I've often wondered about a layout set during the hours of darkness, with little to be seen other than mysterious black outlines and random pools of light. Compensating for the lack of visual information, there'd be a huge emphasis on evocative sound – the swish of tyres on wet roads, muffled voices, whistles, the tickover of unseen diesels.

Overnight travel confers a magical atmosphere on busy stations such as Crewe, Cardiff or Carlisle, while marshalling yards are (or were) even more enigmatic once darkness fell. Some of my best memories of steam days are set in the small hours, with the sounds of distant shunting (which went on around the clock), the clank of light engines, the abrupt movement of point and signal rodding, the equally sudden arrival of overnight trains from exotic places such as Stranraer and Penzance, Aberdeen and Fishguard, Swansea and Holyhead. Most shadowy of all were the mysterious workings of parcels and mail traffic.

Everyone knows W. H. Auden's verse This is the Night Mail crossing the border... with its hypnotic four-cylinder rhythm. The early hours were when you saw unusual things, even in Yorkshire, none more foreign to my eyes than bogie vans in Post Office red emblazoned with the royal cypher, criss-crossing the country on their smartly-timed interconnecting journeys. Some of these mail trains carried passengers unwise or desperate enough to travel at such an hour – I rode the overnight York-Swansea a number of times (invariably double-headed in steam days, heavy enough at times to warrant a 4,500hp combination of English Electric and BR/Sulzer Type 4s). More modeller-friendly – but off-limits to the travelling public was the Whitehaven-Huddersfield >>> AND PARAGO



Travelling Post Office (TPO) that left the Cumbrian coast in the early evening and called at Preston, Bolton and Manchester Victoria before reaching its destination around 12.30am. A scant half-hour was allowed for business before the train was on its way back, with arrival in plenty of time for breakfast (and for early-morning daylight photography – unlike vampires, not all TPO trains appeared only after night had fallen).

Like many of its kind, the Whitehaven-Huddersfield had an achievable formation – a Mk 1 Post Office sorting van bookended by three BR Mk 1 BGs used as stowage vans (very occasionally a GUV might be substituted). All these are available from Bachmann, while Hornby offers an excellent BG. The liveries obviously changed over time, but the choice of vehicles - as with many mail trains – remained pretty steady until the service was withdrawn on September 27 1991. Motive power was equally consistent – a Stanier 'Black Five' or even a 'Britannia' in steam days, while most TOPS-era photographs show the train in the charge of either a Class 31 or 47, with a '25' standing in on occasion. So, with all this mysterious and undeniably evocative overnight traffic on offer, let's see about making a start. Hn



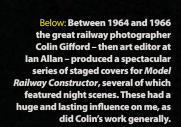


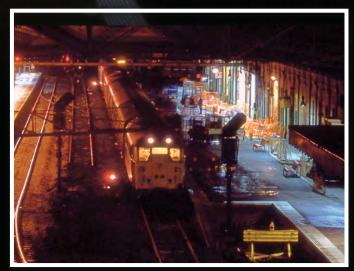
The magic continued well into the diesel era, as Alan Whitehouse found when he followed these enigmatic overnight trains around the country as part of the long-term research for his 2016 book *Night Trains of British Rail*. Here we see the Whitehaven-Huddersfield TPO with the usual four-coach formation at the start of its journey, with sorters hard at work ahead of the five-hour journey (left and below). A little before 1 am on the final night of operation, September 27 1991, an unidentified Class 31 is seen at Huddersfield ready for the return journey with extra vehicles added to the consist (below right). A far more minimal TPO (the antithesis of the majestic Up Special seen in *Night Mail*) was the Lincoln-Derby leg of the Lincoln-Crewe TPO which, in the late 1980s, consisted of a BG and TPO hauled by a Class 31, in this case 31413 *Severn Valley Railway* awaiting departure (above). Alan Whitehouse.

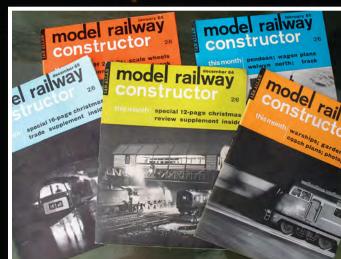

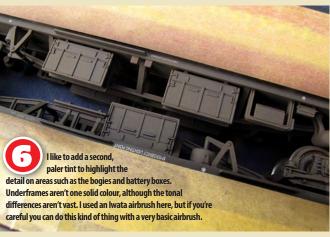
I like to use acrylic paints, and airbrushes, for weathering areas such as coach underframes, roofs and ends. They dry quickly and provide a stable surface for subsequent applications with enamel washes or weathering powders. I've no idea how many of these excellent LifeColor sets (Black Rubber – CS27 and Rail Weathering – CS21) I must have worked through over the years – dozens, easily.

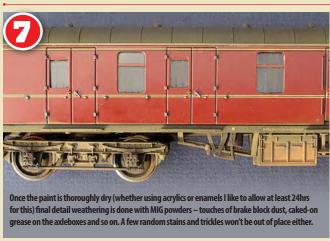














The roof colours are treated a similar way, with two applications of colour. Be sure to take the weathering right down to the cantrail – this is why masking tape is such a good idea, so you're not worried about getting paint on the coach sides.

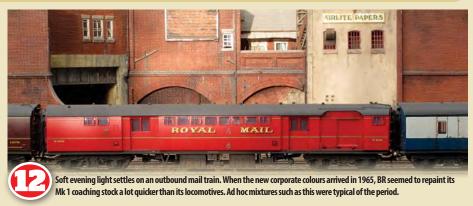

## On the Colon again

Train Truckers meets Scrapheap Challenge as **TIM**

T'S ONLY GUYS doing their job," said Greg, who drives 2000-ton freight trains for a living. "I don't know why they big it up into such a drama." We were talking about the TV programme *Train Truckers*, which I'd never seen, but I was more intent on the scale-length trains of slab steel and coil that were rumbling past

on Greg's impressive home layout set in Aston Villa territory (HM154). So, when I got back to Suffolk I watched a couple of episodes on catch-up, and was intrigued by the modelling possibilities – my father had been in road haulage

all his life so I knew the ropes.

The way things come together never ceases to fascinate me either. A couple of days later I was rummaging through a cupboard and found a bag of discarded models I'd completely forgotten about. Among the detritus were a couple of Airfix locomotive kits that I'd once used for weathering experiments. They were in a sorry state after many years squirreled away in the darkness but sufficiently recoverable for me to put two and two together - here was prime Train Truckers material, surely!

This feature is the result. No TMD layout is complete without a shabby-looking diesel being hauled off to the scrapyard and every roadway scene has to have a Class 800 parked up on a low-loader. I wanted something different, however, and I wanted to do it properly as well as making it readily achievable.

My choice was to present an ex-Barry '9F' 2-10-0, still largely derelict but showing signs of partial restoration, being moved from one preservation site to another on the kind of heavy-haul vehicles I'd seen from time to time thumping along the motorway, hazards flashing, at a steady 40mph.

A trawl of the internet produced

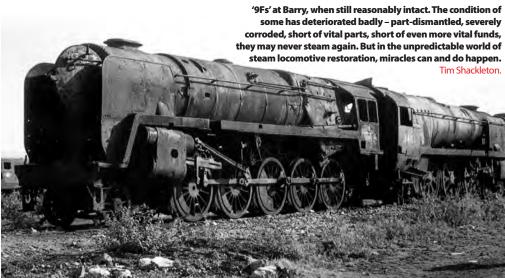

a couple of discontinued die-cast lorries at extremely affordable prices while my various stockpiles furnished other usable bits and pieces. As for the results, I'm sure bona fide preservationists and transport buffs will find plenty of faults in terms of missed (and misinterpreted) detail but with this kind of weekend project, I feel it's the overall impression that counts.

#### **RECREATING ROAD HAULAGE IN '00' SCALE**







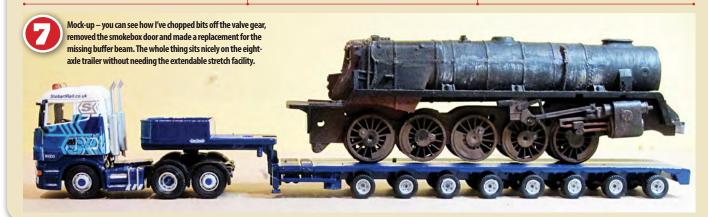
By comparison with the Bachmann model there are a lot of compromises in the old Kitmaster'9F' but with a saving of at least £100 on typical prices I could live with most of them. The clumsy handrails had to go, however—I used a brutal-looking cutting burr in my Dremel.



The power tool shaved most of it off and then I got to work with a blade. I used one that was just starting to lose its cutting edge — fine for taking off thin slices of plastic but not so sharp it takes half the boiler with it too.

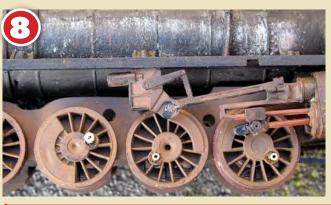


With many types of hand tool, it's useful to work 'into the light' – with the model between yourself and your light source. The shadows enable you to see bumps and blemishes more easily.

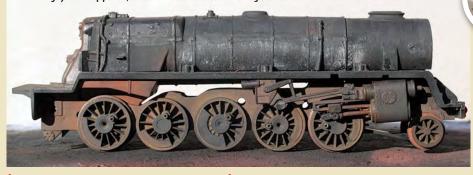


Fitting crankpins makes a big difference — I made these out of lengths of brass capillary tube set into holes drilled into the wheels. Go carefully — heat from the drill can easily melt soft plastic.

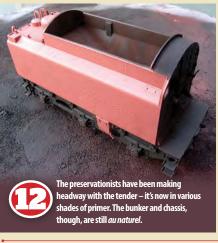
I made the smokebox door locking bar out of 1mm brass rod with the centre section filed flat and filled in the outer rim with styrene. The missing buffer beam had mysteriously reappeared, so I chopped off the buffers but left the drawhook in place. The shape of the steam pipes, however, is wrong — perhaps I should have removed them altogether.



It looked like I'd originally used dry-brushing to weather the locomotive, so I rounded off some of the rough edges with an airbrush. This adds to the impression of layers of weathering building up over years of exposure to the elements. Many parts were stripped from these engines both at Barry and while awaiting restoration, leading to bare-bones engines that were largely devoid of pipework, oil feeds and other features of a working locomotive.



A gentle dusting with rust-coloured weathering powders helps finish things off nicely. Asbestos cladding was everywhere on scrap locomotives, betrayed by an ominous white powder spilling out from beneath the boiler cladding. Not until the early 1970s was the health risk fully understood – drastic steps had to be taken to strip asbestos from railway equipment of all kinds.





I kept the weathering of the tractor-trailer units very simple — despite heavy, intensive use these vehicles invariably look smart. The decks and undersides of the low-loaders are lightly airbrushed and I've run a thin grey-brown wash over the cab roofs and then wiped it off so the residue collects in the panel lines. I hand-painted the tyres to get rid of the shiny black and then brushed gunmetal weathering powder over the steel parts of the flatbed.



Rust colours can often be much too lurid for comfort, which is why I'm a great fan of LifeColor's pre-mixed weathering paints – whether applied by hand or by airbrush they perfectly capture the muted, strangely beautiful colours of the real thing. I use them extensively on projects such as this.



As per prototype, the locomotive and tender sit on flat-bottom rail (code 70 in this instance) secured to the flatbed of each trailer. As well as minor detailing — I must do something about those solid pipes leading up to the clack valves — I need to chain the wheels to the trailer. I'm pleased by the contrast between the partly restored tender and the bare hulk of the '9F'.

## TIP

The old Airfix '9F' plastic kit provided the perfect basis for a down-at-heel restoration project. There is no point using an expensive brand new item for this.

## THE DIGITAL DAWN

Hornby utilised cutting-edge technology for its Zero 1 digital control system in the late 1970s. **MARK CHIVERS** looks back at a revolutionary development which was literally decades ahead of its time.

ORNBY UNVEILED ITS revolutionary new model railway control system, Zero 1, in the 25<sup>th</sup> edition of its annual catalogue in 1979. Its snappy brand name reflected the use of binary numbers and the system really was ahead of its time which is now considered a precursor to the Digital Command Control (DCC) offerings available today.

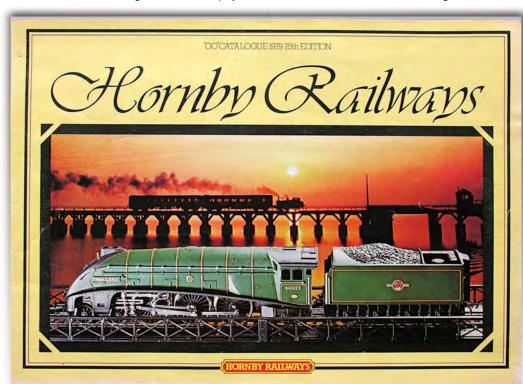
Developed around Texas Instruments' technology, Zero 1 was vastly different to what had gone before as you could now operate locomotives individually, up to 16 of them, without the need for section switches or isolating tracks as power to the rails was now constant. Special address modules in each engine, dubbed 'chips' at the time, interpreted commands from the main controller for acceleration/ deceleration and speed rates. Zero 1 was a 4amp system which operated on the two wires principle and delivered 18volts AC to the track for powering motive power and accessories.

The range comprised a master controller (Cat No. R950), slave controller (R951), hand-held slave controller (R952) and locomotive modules (R955) initially, with accessory modules (R956) following in due course. The third and final phase included a rather impressive looking Micromimic display system with a display module (R953), display panel (R957), display console (R958) and display leads (R959).

Interestingly, much like the proverbial bus, there were other similar controllers being developed at the time to rival Zero 1 including the Airfix Multiple Train Control (MTC) system, which was frequency-based and Hammant and Morgan's (H&M) digital HM5000, which shared compatibility with Hornby's product.

## **PUSHING CONTROL**

Zero 1's master controller featured a push-button keyboard, slide control regulator, indicator lights, a roster reminder, a groove to store a pen or pencil - remember, this was the '70s – and a panic button offered reassurance should things get out of control. In addition, up to three slave controllers could be linked together to allow

four locomotives to be directly controlled, while the system's memory could also store running characteristics for the remainder of the motive power roster. It could also support up to 99 accessories.

Locomotive address modules developed over time but needed to be connected directly to the motor wiring on each individual locomotive. Spade connections made some of these connections quite straightforward, although some older models required the intervention of a soldering iron – rather like hard wiring a DCC decoder today. Special silver paint





was used for coding or recoding address modules. However, this mix of modern technology and older style mechanisms could sometimes prove to be inefficient as a result of corrupted signals. Rail joints also needed to be snug.

Meanwhile, accessory modules which provided control for four turnouts or signals could also supply a burst of current for point changing or continuous current for accessories such as colour light signals, in similar principle to the digital accessory decoders of today. A pack of live point clips was included to transform self-

isolating turnouts to permanently live. With constant power to the track, locomotive or interior carriage lights (where fitted) were also permanently illuminated.

## **NEW HORIZONS**

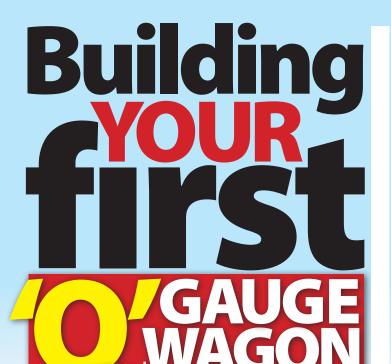
The final phase of the system was the mimic display with its honeycomb backplate. Each screen measured 280mm x 200mm and fine lines of self-adhesive tape could be cut to size/shape and added between the marked squares to create a mimic track diagram, while LEDs showed the current state of turnouts. Each

display panel was supplied with four pairs of LEDs and could power eight pairs in total, while extra LEDs and modules were sold separately for further expansion.

In practice, installing and coding locomotive modules could be time-consuming and developing the mimic track diagram with sticky paper tape could be cumbersome, but it was innovative technology at the time. There were even plans to introduce sound and pre-programming functions – an area that we have come to take for granted with digital systems, such as Hornby's RailMaster, today.

Sadly, Hornby's early dabble with digital was relatively shortlived as production of controllers at Margate ceased in 1986 when demand for the system had waned. However, it wasn't quite the end for the system as products remained in the marketplace for some time - module production eventually stopped some five years later - and ZTC Controls even included a Zero 1 mode within its DCC systems. Meanwhile, a buoyant secondhand market still sees examples of the distinctive control system and supporting components appearing from time to time. IIIm

It might come as a surprise, but it can actually be simpler to build an 'O' gauge kit than a 'OO' one - the parts are bigger and easier to handle and, from our experience, getting the running right is much more achievable too as they are heavier when constructed without adding weight.

If you are looking to make your first step into 'O' gauge wagon kit building then look no further than the Parkside



Models range of plastic kits. These will feel familiar to anyone who has built a plastic kit in the past making them ideal for all skill levels. Each kit contains all the components you need – even transfers. Just add paint, tools and adhesive and you are ready to go.

This step by step guide is aimed at illustrating the basics of building a Parkside Models kit. We've chosen a BR 12ton Pipe wagon as the subject as we know that open wagons are simpler to complete than covered vans. Having built this kit before we also know the pitfalls and which techniques suit it best. We've also got a nifty product for blackening etched metal parts (there are only a handful in the kit) which makes a difference too.

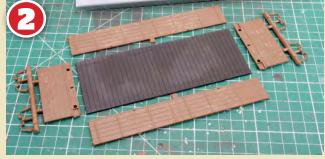




The Parkside Models kit range is well established and offers everything you need to build a wagon apart from tools, glue and paint. BR period transfers are included in the box together with a full set of injection moulded parts. You will also find etched metal and cast metal parts in the '0' gauge kits.







There are two main areas to consider in each kit – the body and the underframe. In all cases we start with the body. If you are choosing your first kit, an open wagon will always be simpler to assemble.



To remove the ends from their sprue cut dose to the part with a craft knife. Inevitably there will be moulding pips to remove which are simple to dean up.



Each part is cleaned up before assembly. We use a collection of Aibion Hobbies sanding sticks which come in different colours to distinguish different grades.



## STEP BY STEP BUILDING A PARKSIDE MODELS 'O' GAUGE PIPE WAGON



Assembly of the body can now start by gluing one of the ends in place. There is a channel at the bottom of the end panel above the bufferbeam which locates the wagon floor. Hold the parts together then brush Plastic Magic liquid plastic cement along the rear face of the joint (away from the visible area) and allow it to set.





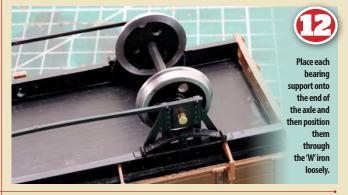

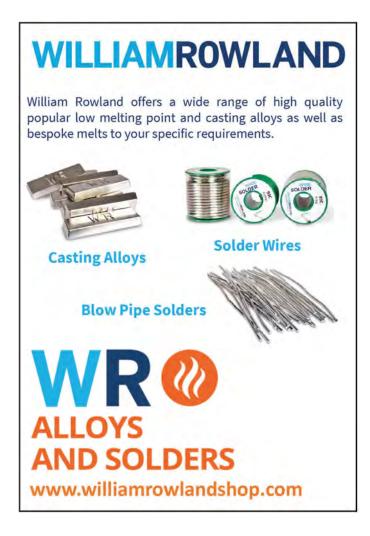

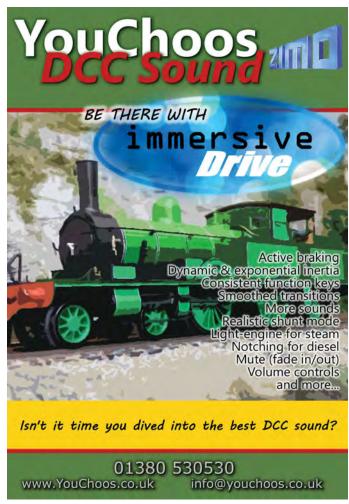

## Appearance and price deter younger modellers

S A 16-YEAR-OLD, I expect that I am a member of a disappointingly miniscule minority within my age group who reads your excellent magazine and, indeed, delves into the model railway hobby at all. To me, this seems a real shame because there has been an abundance of people my age who, upon witnessing a demonstration of my very basic layout, have been inspired.

There are two key factors that repel young people from the hobby: firstly, it's simply not 'cool' to be a modeller, and many would sadly see model railways as a blemish on their reputations. Secondly, even if this first barrier

was overcome, there would still be very few who began modelling simply because it is unaffordable.

I was gifted my first train set – the Hornby Lakelander – nine years ago, and I have since built up a collection of 32 locomotives to run around a relatively sizeable loft layout. However, I am frequently left frustrated by the leading manufacturers' unwillingness or incapability of catering for people like me. The recent obsession with limited edition releases means that I have no chance to purchase many of the best models, which are often those that ideally suit my layout's time period and location.

There have been some recent examples where models I would have liked have sold out before I

was aware they had been released. How can manufacturers talk about looking forward to the future when they fail to offer options to young people like me, who must surely be enticed if model railways are to survive another century? There is no use in providing starter sets for five-year-olds, RailRoad models for ten-year-olds, and then skipping straight to limited edition releases for affluent adults.

To finish, I would like to commend stores such as Hatton's, who do at least seem to recognise in part the need to engage young people, for without their regular bargain offers, my fleet would consist solely of Hornby 0-4-0STs and RailRoad diesel shunters. Instead, I am able to occasionally invest in such high-

quality products as the Heljan DPU and Bachmann 'Hall'. Yet even these superb deals are rapidly becoming unsustainable as manufacturers raise prices further, and most of my purchases (whether locomotives, coaches or wagons) now come from model railway shows, where preowned stores provide a last bastion of affordability in an increasingly elitist hobby. Yet it cannot be solely through the sale of models from the past that our hobby hopes to ensure its future, for this will surely doom manufacturers and retailers alike. So, as prices continue to sky-rocket whilst wages remain stagnant, I beg of the model railway industry to look to the future rather than focussing on short-term gain.

## St. Guthberts

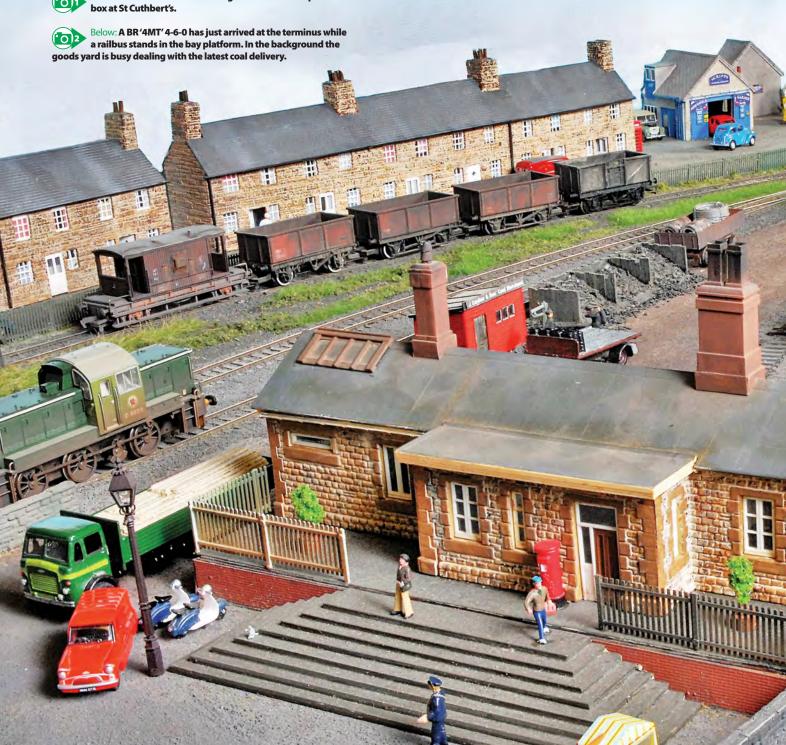


A sleepy terminus in the Scottish Borders just before the Beeching cuts is the setting for Thistle Modelmakers' 'OO' gauge exhibition layout, which was designed for members of all abilities.

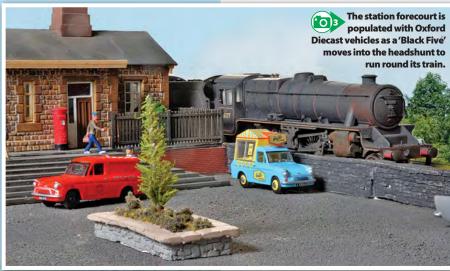


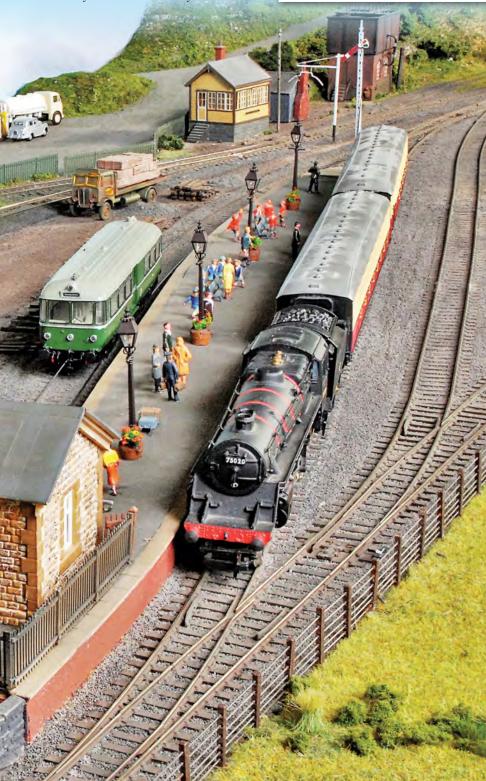


HE IDEA FOR ST CUTHBERT'S grew from our wish to involve all members in the club, new and established, in a project that would enable everyone to develop their skills in the many different aspects of layout development.

Our club has a number of overseas layouts, mainly German and American, and there was a group of members that wanted to build something with a British theme. We wanted to start by sawing wood (safely!) for the baseboard and end with a layout capable of being exhibited at shows. Guidance from the experienced members helped the newcomers see, and work on, every aspect of that development process.

Thistle Modelmakers is no different from any other model railway club in





wanting to encourage interest in the hobby and St Cuthbert's enabled everyone to gain knowledge from experts in many different topics that will help them be better modellers in future. We hoped that everything would be a learning process and, as you'll see, that has certainly come true during this project.

We decided to base our layout in the Scottish Borders, just prior to the events that followed Dr Beeching's report. It is a typical country terminus with passenger and goods workings still in demand although business is drifting downwards as car and van ownership increases. Steam locomotives and Diesel Multiple Units provide the motive power for passenger traffic. Freight workings provide general goods and coal traffic into the village while milk and cattle are shipped out.

## **DEVELOPMENT**

We had to design a layout that was relatively light whilst ensuring that it maintained enough rigidity to survive transport to shows. Initially a decision was made to construct three boards each measuring 750mm x 1,200mm or as the more 'experienced' members called it, 2ft 6in x 4ft.

9mm plywood was cut into 100mm strips to make the frame and we added in cross-bracing to help strengthen the structure. This was all topped off with a surface of 9mm plywood. It was painted to help stop any twisting before any track was laid. Steel engineers' dowel pins were added for precise alignment. This is essential when you attend exhibitions on a regular basis to avoid derailments and interruptions to the operating timetable.

Track design was an iterative process resulting in a plan that is representative of many country branch termini and maintains the interest of both show visitors and operators with a storage yard to hold the remainder of the stock.

The first version of St Cuthbert's had two boards for the station and town while the third board was a hillside with farmhouses and fields. Underneath these fields was a small storage yard. Having completed the scenery, we stood back, congratulated ourselves and thought "Isn't that good?"."



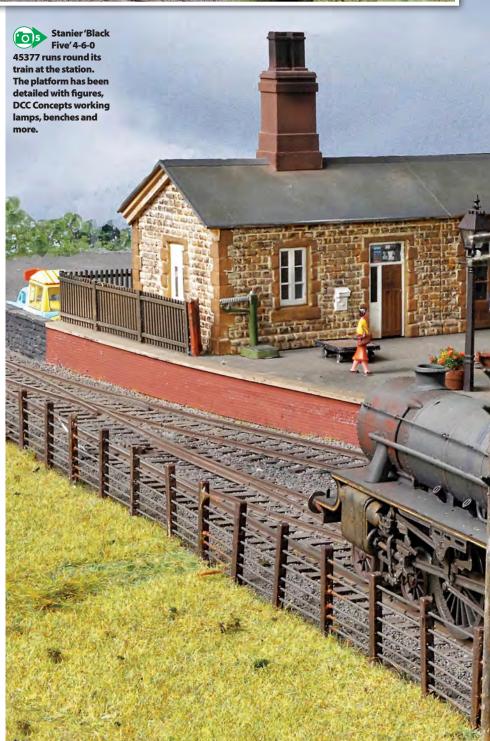
Then we tried to run the layout at its first exhibition, and we realised things were not as good as we first thought. Accessing the off-scene yard was a nightmare - it was too inaccessible for operations and very limiting in what you could do operationally, coupled with the fact that it was so dark underneath that operators couldn't see, even after adding interior lighting. Another learning experience.

An executive decision had to be taken. The hillside board and all its scenery was scrapped and replaced with an open storage yard. After the limitations of the first design, it was decided we needed to have a bit more space, and the storage area was extended by a foot to 5ft long. This would allow us to incorporate a small run-round loop for steam locomotives so we could run trains engine first and reduce the amount of handling of the rolling stock. This version works.

Electrically, we always design for DCC operation using the Lenz system. We have built up a stock of flight cases with separate power, control, track and point modules. This is now our standard for all layouts and means we can wire any of our layouts the same way using 25-way D connectors, male connectors for track boxes and female for point boxes. It also reduces equipment costs. Controller sockets are fitted at the back and front of the layout allowing operators to talk to visitors more easily. We include track sectioning to permit train location feedback, so if we decide to automate operations in future it's simply a case of connecting the layout to a PC Module and a laptop.

All points are driven by servos connected to MERG servo driver boards linked to the Lenz system. Our run-round loop also incorporates a servo driven sector plate.

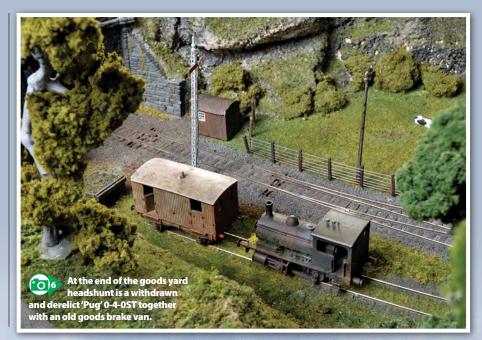
The buildings have LED lighting in many of their rooms, controlled by some MERG circuitry. A versatile timer linked to an event sequencer gives a lighting sequence that switches the lights and then cycles them continuously.



## **A LAYOUT TOUR**

After a long journey from the mainline, we arrive in St Cuthbert's. On a summer evening there is no finer journey - perhaps someone should think about describing it in a book in the future. Passing under the road bridge, the AA motorcyclist has stopped to call his office at the company's telephone box while up in the hills the laird seems to be looking for cover before he sees anything worth a pot shot.

Our train is routed to the main platform. The bay holds a DMU waiting to depart. Beyond that platform, there is some indication of what the future holds, as tracks are already starting to be lifted. The goods yard has had a delivery of fish from the coast and, nearby, the coalman is busy bagging up today's delivery of nutty slack. The brewery has just put a delivery of beer onto the dray wagon as it now trots off to its next eager customer. The taxi waits for its next hire while the ice cream van hopes for some customers.

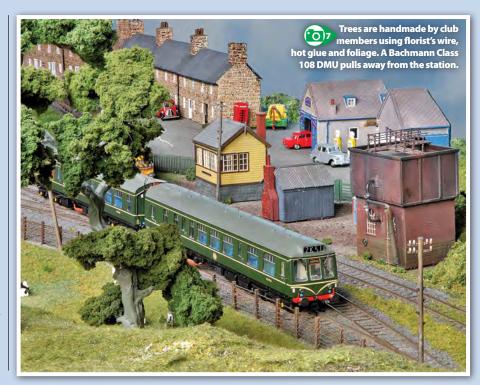




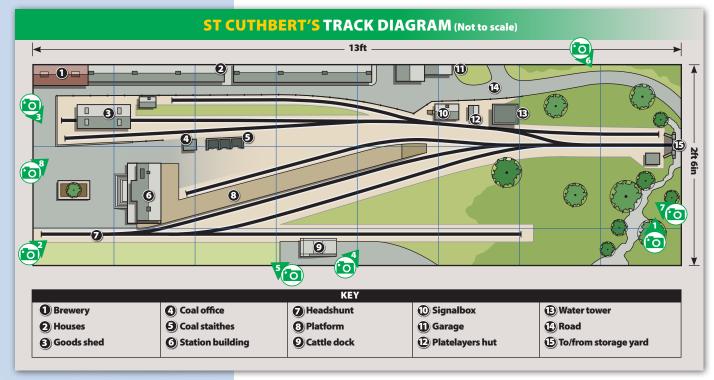
from the next passenger train arrival. The local garage has a few patrons hoping their repairs won't take too long!

The rolling hills of the Borders have been created using extruded building foam, carved with a knife, scraped with a saw blade and then covered with Jesmonite AC300. This specialist twopart plaster is extremely strong once it has cured and is light but doesn't crack when transported. It provides a very solid support for the trees on the layout as foam on its own will not provide that strength. The rock faces are scribed to highlight the strata and are then painted with exterior rough paint, before being painted with acrylics to look like rocks. The grass has been 'planted' using static grass products and our home-made applicator.

The cottages are Wills kits that have been modified and the stonework stones painted individually to give the required finish. The station building and cattle dock were constructed from kits as first builds by newer members. The water tower was a solo effort by one of our younger members who discovered that shaping handrails









is not as easy as the books tell you.

There are many different methods for making model trees. Our trees are made using florist's wire and hot melt glue. The wire is shaped to roughly represent the branch structure and extruding the hot glue up and down the length of the wire bundle produces the effect of gnarled trees. Running the side of the gun's outlet enables those gnarls to be flattened down to represent smoother bark. The glue quickly cools but can be reheated and reshaped easily. They can be painted using spray cans or acrylics. The leaves use various sizes and colours of flock depending on the species. An advantage is that it remains pliable so branches can be repositioned at will. Since the design maintains that pliability, they are ideal for surviving the effects of travel.

On the scenic side, we need to think about adding or replacing some of the buildings. We've done it before so why change our habits? It's always interesting to add little vignettes that provide interest to the viewer so we'll continue to add these features although what they will be is a topic for discussion on a future club night. We've already changed the brewery's name because we realised that during the build, it had acquired a German one. It now has a more appropriate company name.

## **OPERATION**

Our stock is mainly Hornby, Bachmann and Dapol. The flexible location of St Cuthbert's in Southern Scotland enables us to operate 'Black Fives', DMUs and a shunter. All locomotives are chipped, with some having sound as well. Some of the stock is weathered, some not. Mastering the spray gun, paints and powders is another area for developing club members' skills.

The sequence of trains is currently

led by the operators at the time, so whatever the controller decides, happens. However, there are plans afoot to include a timetable based on a prototypical branch line terminus from the borders. Timetabling will have to be a balance between historical reality and the need for exhibition customers to see trains moving. These backwaters did not see a constant flow of trains coming and going, but visitors have paid money and won't be happy to learn that the next train isn't due for two hours. Finding the happy medium will be another goal.

So, what next? On the operational side, we have built in the ability to monitor train positions and feedback but not implemented it. We will use either JMRI or Railroad & Co Train Controller software to make operation easier. Our copy of the latter was purchased many years ago and used for control of other club layouts so we have experience in using it. JMRI is up-to-date and a free download, so additional cost is not the issue, but we have less knowledge of its use. We haven't decided yet.

### **ON TARGET**

Overall, this layout has met its original goals. Everyone has seen the development process, contributed to it and learnt skills along the way. The confidence of the newer members to offer constructive criticism has grown and we are all much more capable of contributing to future designs. To that end, our next layout will be a modern day representation of Detroit with moving trains and cars. It is being led by one of the youngest members of the club. Hopefully, it will have fewer surprises than St Cuthbert's.

## Ashford International Model Railway Education Centre PRESERVING MODEL RAILWAY HERITAGE

A new permanent model railway centre is being planned for Ashford. **CLIFF PARSONS** brings the story of the Ashford International

Model Railway Education Centre up to date.

HE Ashford International Model Railway Education Centre (AIMREC) charity was set up four years ago and its main purpose is to preserve some of the finest model railways created over the last 50 years. It will use them for educational purposes by showing the importance of railways in our industrial heritage.

The dream has been to create a permanent exhibition centre to house model railways of different scales and designs. The group had several sites under consideration but these did not come to fruition for various reasons. However, during the last few months we have been given an option to lease the lower ground floor of the old Debenhams store in Ashford town centre together with five other retail units giving us a total area of 38,000sq ft to begin realising our aim. In the meantime, Ashford Borough Council has given us a short lease of a new unit for us to use as a marketing suite for fundraising purposes. The suite is normally open on Saturday and Sunday only from 10am-4pm and has been very successfully patronised each weekend. Admission is free, although with recent events we recommend checking that the suite is open before travelling.

Amongst the layouts on display in the marketing suite we have the Railmen of Kent's winning layout from Channel 5's 2019 Great Model Railway Challenge which is proving to be a big hit with the children. It is joined by Cliff Parsons exhibition favourite The Gresley Beat which models the East Coast Main Line in the heyday of the LNER in 'OO' gauge, Gordon and Maggie Gravett's stunning 1:50 rural French scene Pempoul and Orpington and District Model Railway Club's fascinating multi-gauge 7mm scale layout Theobald's Yard.

If AIMREC is successful with its plans, the centre will offer the visitor many layouts in different scales from 'N' to Gauge 3 depicting



scenes from around the world. Other modelling disciplines including plastic modelling, military, ships, aircraft and road transport, steam punk and dolls houses will spread the interest and diversification for the visitor centre.

Our vision for the centre is that our visitors, young or old, will be able to immerse themselves in the story of our railway heritage in a handson experience, using interactive technology which will be specifically designed and constructed.

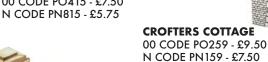

# Bachmann Class 121 The Pressed Steel single-car Class 121 DMUs have been a popular subject. Bachmann has released a brand-new version for 'OO' gauge which MARK CHIVERS inspects.

ACHMANN'S long-awaited 'OO' gauge model of the popular BR Class 121 diesel railcar touched down in the Hornby Magazine office during March. 16 of these versatile singlecar units were built by Pressed Steel and introduced to service with BR's Western Region in 1960.

They were ideal for branch line use while their high-density seating and six-a-side slam doors also made them useful on commuter services too. Each AEC (latterly Leyland) powered unit featured a driver's cab at both ends and 65 Second Class seats in two saloons with a 2+3 configuration. Most seats were aligned with an external passenger door. They were compatible with

units designated with the blue square coupling code, including ten similar single-cab Class 121 Driving Trailer Seconds (DTS).

Given their 70mph top speed, units were deployed on Western Region suburban lines as well as lightly used branch lines including the likes of the Bridport and Lyme Regis branches in the 1960s. They were also regulars on services further into the West Country as well as around Bristol and Cardiff, plus West London/Thames Valley commuter operations in/out of London Paddington too.

During the mid-1980s, a few were utilised in the West Midlands and in later years Bletchley depot gained an allocation as well. As units were >>>

Bachmann has done a superb job of modelling the Pressed Steel Class 121 'Bubble Car', Decoration is excellent too, making this a strong choice for compact layouts.

withdrawn from passenger service, their usefulness was recognised with some Class 121s gaining a new lease as departmental, route learner and sandite vehicles. In the early 2000s, Chiltern Railways and Arriva Trains Wales re-introduced the class for passenger service - the curtain finally coming down in 2017.

### **THE MODEL**

Models of the Class 121 have been a regular feature in 'OO' gauge with the first being produced by Lima (now with Hornby) in the late 1990s. That product stood as the only ready-to-run choice until 2017 when Dapol released brand-new versions of the Pressed Steel units in a variety of liveries.

Bachmann first announced its plans to produce the Class 121 in 2015 and despite the arrival of the Dapol model it has continued with its project. Three standard 'bubble cars' have been produced as W55027 in BR green with speed whiskers (Cat No. 35-525), W55025 in BR blue and grey (35-526) and 55024 in BR Network SouthEast (revised) livery (35-527), plus a limited-edition model of W55020 in GW150 chocolate and cream (35-525Z) for Kernow Model Rail Centre.

Bachmann's new 'OO' model certainly looks the part, capturing the characterful appearance of the prototype well. Our review

in BR blue and grey, representing Plymouth based unit P125 in early 1980s condition with 'cut' buffers. painted-over four-character headcode box and bodyside heater grilles. Bachmann's tooling suite also reflects alternative body/buffer/headcode box combinations across the releases.

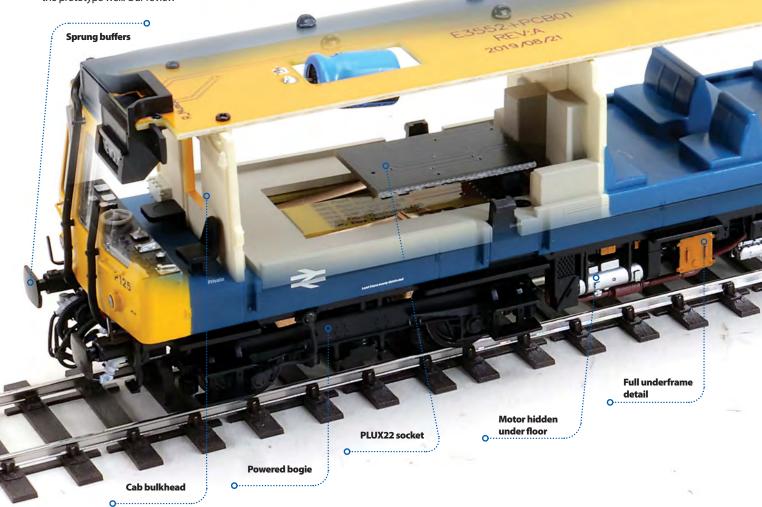
Amongst the impressive detailing, the model features sprung metal buffers, separately fitted handrails, grab handles and bogie footsteps, windscreen wipers, lamp irons, detailed interior, an impressive array of underframe mounted engine

vertical exhaust stacks at one end, well defined bogies and much more.

Look closer and you'll notice the finely moulded directional marker lights, door handles, hinges and door stoppers, plus bodyside coolant caps picked out in silver - even the droplight push bars are there. With three large cab windows at each end, the highly visible driver's cab interior is also neatly detailed and painted - just look at the vacuum brake handle and see-through sections to the passenger compartments - and given the available space within,

neatly moulded vents and a smooth suggest subtle panel lines.

Decoration is top notch – once again Bachmann has delivered a high-quality BR blue and grey paint scheme with fine white lining and sufficiently dense yellow cab ends. Small details such as door lettering and running numbers are crisp as are the tiny 'Please close the door' and 'No smoking' window labels – you may need a magnifying glass, though! This fine printing also extends to the cab front data



**68** May 2020 www.hornbymagazine.com panel information at one end, too. As this model is based on a West Country unit, it carries appropriate Newquay branch destinations – Par and Newquay – at respective ends in the illuminating indicator boxes.

Underneath, the 121 features an extensive complement of engine components, some picked out in silver and red oxide, as per the prototype, along with flexible speedometer cables between the bogie and underframe – a new and welcome development.

## **PERFORMANCE**

Bachmann has taken the opportunity to include a low-slung three-pole can motor and flywheel within a moulded engine section which extends just below the main floor and is hidden by the various separately fitted engine components. It matches the style of the mechanism used in the new Class 158/159 (HM153). This, in turn, drives a geared bogie at the No. 1 end (guard's compartment)

Bachmann to model the interior and floor to a near full depth in the passenger compartment.

Following an initial period of running-in our review sample negotiated *Hornby Magazine's* office test layout with ease, running smoothly throughout the speed range. Slow speed running was particularly impressive. When you first pick the '121' up it feels a little lighter than some other models, but this didn't seem to detract from its operation and it proved sufficiently sure-footed to handle a couple of extra carriages without issue, simulating additional DMU trailer cars.

The underframe also houses the speaker chamber (with factory-fitted cube speaker) and a series of six switches which enable analogue users to fine tune the lighting options such as directional marker lights, illuminated destination blinds and cab/passenger saloon

lighting. Digital Command Control users can automatically control these via function keys, provided a suitable PluX22 DCC decoder is fitted (the socket is in the guard's compartment) - Bachmann offers a nine-function example (Cat No. 36-570), which should be adequate. On test, the lighting functions worked well, there was no sign of light bleed and it was possible to switch the directional markers and destination blind light off at one end, when coupled to another unit for example. If you wish to add digital sound, all you have to do is add a suitable PluX22 sound decoder the speaker is already in place.

Each bogie is neatly moulded with brake shoes in line with wheels, while small tension lock couplings in NEM pockets are fitted at each end and a bufferbeam detailing pack containing pipework, cosmetic screw link couplings and multiple working sockets for each end is included.

## **OVERALL**

Bachmann's new 'OO' gauge Class 121 is a superb addition to the range and a perfect all-in-one train. It can be coupled with similar DMU vehicles or be operated on its own and won't look out of place on a mainline, secondary route or branch line layout. The extra refinements on this model elevate it above models that have gone before - the flexible speedometer cable, low profile motor and fully moulded interior - offering a superb'bubble car'that will consign my previous 'cut-and-shut' Lima model to the scrapyard. IRELESS CONTROL is one of the great advantages of modern Digital Command Control systems. However, most use radio signals which by their nature and frequency have a short range and often have limitations on large layouts.

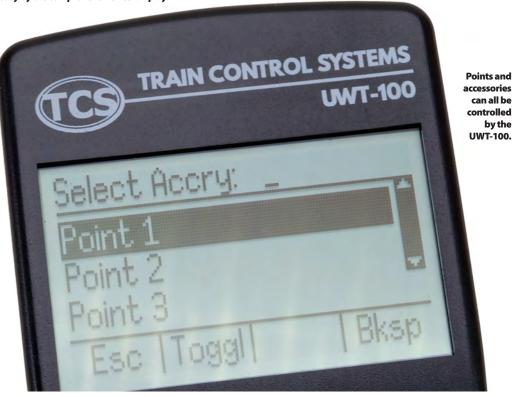
Train Control Systems (TCS) has developed a new universal wireless controller which uses WiFi (wireless networking, as used by broadband devices and smartphones), to offer robust and reliable communication. Moreover, it also allows use of the handset with a wider range of Digital Control systems – in essence it can work with a range of controllers which have an option for WiFi control including layouts operated by JMRI software which can link to WiThrottle server and MRCWiFi as well as NCE and Digitrax systems where a WiFi link module is connected. Our understanding is that it won't link to all European digital systems, such as the Roco Z21, so we recommend checking with TCS that the device is compatible with your system. Our tests were conducted with the Gaugemaster WiFi extension.

WiFi control isn't new to model railways, but a dedicated handset designed to use this protocol is. In the past WiFi operation has required either a computer or smartphone app, but none of these have the tactile response of a handset. That's where the TCS UWT-100 comes in – it fills the need for a wireless handset with maximum range and reliability.

The handset is battery powered but doesn't have a connection to charge it. It has been designed to work with virtually all types of battery covering both non-rechargeable and rechargeable types with two AA batteries being required to power its system. Impressively, battery life can be as long as 20 hours while the

manufacturer expects that with the low trickle current required to maintain the handset when not in use that it could last six months on the shelf and still provide operation at startup.

The WiFi connection is quick to establish. Set up and connection to the MRCWiFi link on our system took less than 30 seconds and the handset has the ability to connect to WiFi routers with and without passwords. Impressively it can also manage and remember connections to up to nine WiFi networks allowing it to be used with home, exhibition and club layouts, all with separate networks.

In use the handset feels very familiar and anyone who has used the Gaugemaster Prodigy into its operation instantly. It is comfortable to hold and offers simple operation of locomotives, points and accessories. The screen is a full LCD which shows all the information you will need including the locomotive address, direction, speed step, battery power and WiFi signal. There is also a menu across the bottom linked to the top row of buttons which allows quick access to the previous locomotive, horn and two other functions. These functions can also be reassigned to suit individual tastes – a neat option.

Locomotive speed control can be taken via two pairs of buttons or the central thumb wheel to increase and decrease a locomotive's speed. Next is the main menu,

direction control and a shift button which allows access to functions 10-29 – higher functions can also be displayed by pressing the '?' button after the shift key has been pressed. Completing the handset is a full set of function keys (0-9) plus a locomotive select, accessory select, emergency stop and enter button. Also worth mentioning is that TCS has included a pair of LEDs at the head of the unit to act as a torch – ideal for use in coupling up.

Learning the basics is quick and simple and means that you will be up and running and familiar with the handset's operation within one running session. There are a couple of menu routes to understand, like any new product, but in all we found the whole system easy to navigate and operate. Consisting (double heading) and CV programming are also both possible with the UWT-100 and we found the consisting process one of the simplest to use both in setup, operation and clearing double-headed formations.

We had previously used the MRCWiFi link with the WiThrottle application on a smartphone which

showed how good the range could be with WiFi control. The TCS UWT-100 didn't disappoint on this score offering reliable communication with the Prodigy WiFi extension over 50ft and continuous operation of locomotives and accessories at all times. It could also maintain communication through a brick wall – something that model railway DCC radio systems can't do.

The UWT-100 costs £275. That seems high compared with wired handsets, but isn't far adrift from the price of comparable but shorter ranged wireless radio handsets from other sources making it a good choice for wireless control.

The functionality of the new TCS WiFi handset is brilliant and it will be a great addition for anyone who has already been using the Gaugemaster Prodigy WiFi or similar extensions for the NCE or Digitrax control systems. Its flexibility and connectivity are great features and in the right circumstances mean that an operator can take their own handset to a friend's layout. A great product which we can see being a popular and versatile choice for digital layout operation. (MW)

# Heljan revives 'O'gauge REV

The versatile Class 35'Hymek' has been relaunched by Heljan 15 years after the first release. **MIKE WILD** takes a closer look at this reintroduction for 'O' gauge to find out what's new.

HIS IS WHERE it all started for Heljan. In 2005 it announced it would be breaking into the British 'O' gauge market with a readyto-run model of the Western Region Class 35 'Hymek'. That first step has taken the manufacturer on to create an ever-increasing collection of ready-to-run 'O' gauge models, and to the reintroduction of its first 7mm scale model.

The 'Hymeks' were built by Beyer-Peacock in Manchester to provide a Type 3 diesel locomotive on the Western Region with hydraulic

MD870 engine which delivered 1,740hp coupled to a Mekydro transmission which drove all wheels. It was the Western's equivalent of a Class 37 and 101 were built over four years between 1961 and 1965.

The 'Hymek' fleet was numbered D7000-D7100 but like all the dieselhydraulics their working lives were cut short due to the non-standard nature of their transmissions. Withdrawals started in 1971 and the last of the class was switched off in March 1975. Happily, four have

been saved through preservation. See Reality Check for more on the story of the Class 35s.

## THE MODEL

The original batch of Heljan 'Hymeks' was well received, not least because they ushered in a new era of ready-to-run products for 'O' gauge. They have been unavailable new for a long time

and it is great to see that Heljan is looking to its back catalogue in this scale as well as pushing forward with new products.

As standard the original models had twin motors, directional lighting with bulbs, a powered roof fan and a hugely heavy chassis. Relaunching >>>





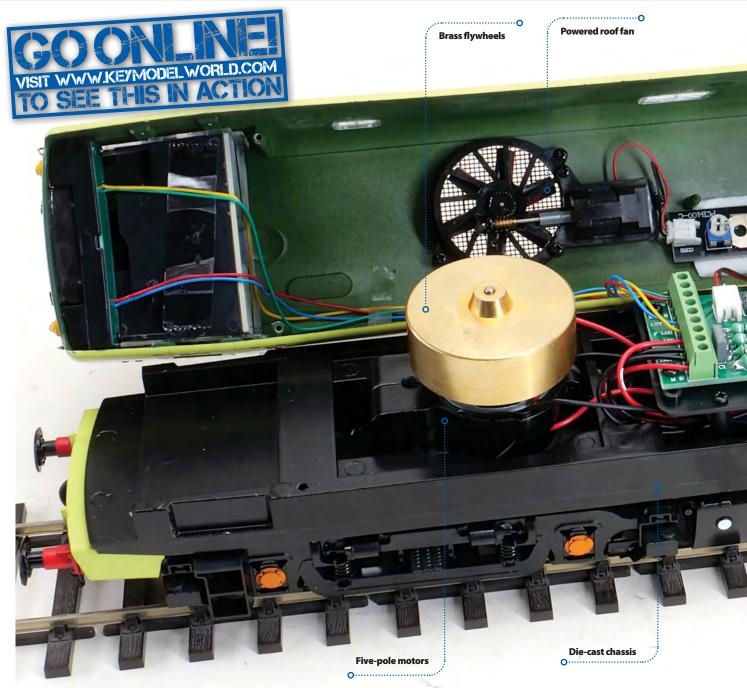

of the model has required a number of useful revisions to bring the '35' up to modern standards. That includes reduction of the chassis weight (though it still tips the scales at 1.6kg) while the lighting has all been upgraded to LEDs and the wiring inside has been colour coded to make it simpler to convert to digital control. There are also new motors.

The externals match the first batch with our sample modelling the classic BR two-tone green livery applied to the class with small yellow warning panels. For the purist it should be noted that the Heljan model is fully accurate for D7003-D7100 as built, while D7000-D7002 had their air horns mounted under the front bufferbeam instead of on top of the cab roof as per the later locomotives. Another small

detail to consider is that the first locomotive, D7000, didn't have a lime green bufferbeam cowling – the only member of the 101 strong fleet not to have this area painted in the lower green colour.

Back to the model, and you get sprung oval buffers of the correct pattern (though we did note a little flash on one), metal handrails, a working screw link coupling and full bufferbeam pipe detail fitted from the factory. The four-character headcode boxes show 1V34 at the No. 1 end and 5V01 at the No. 2 end meaning that this mixed traffic locomotive can be used authentically with Class 1 passenger stock with the 1V code (as they did from South Wales to London) while the 5V suggests an empty coaching stock working.

The cab glazing wasn't as clear as we usually see, but it does

have neatly produced separately fitted windscreen wipers and roof mounted air horns on top while the interior is also fully appointed with a control desk and seats. Along the bodyside Heljan's detailing captures the lines and shapes of the 'Hymek' including the raised roof section of the engine roof, off-set roof fan grille, twin exhausts and bodyside windows.

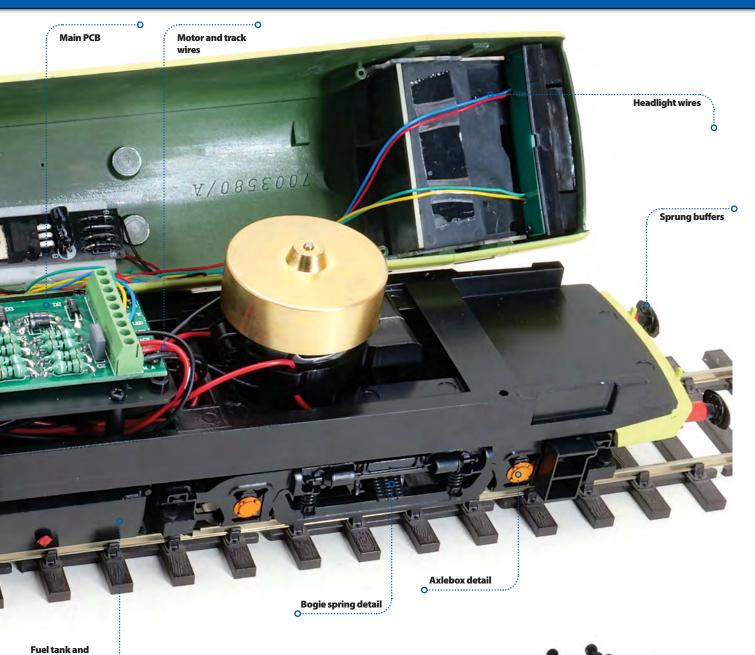
The underframe is equally well done with beautifully detailed models of the Commonwealth bogies the 'Hymeks' rode on together with a neatly finished fuel tank at the centre. The air tanks under each bufferbeam are modelled too.

Decoration of our sample was excellent throughout and, as standard, each version of the 'Hymek' has been released without numbers leaving the purchaser free to add their own choice of identity. As well as the BR two-tone green version with small yellow warning panels shown here (Cat No. 3586) there are also BR two-tone green (without warning panels) (3585), BR two-tone green with full yellow cab front (3587) and BR blue with full yellow cab front (3588) models available too.

#### **PERFORMANCE**

The internal upgrades are a significant step forward for this new batch of 'O' gauge 'Hymeks'. Top of the list are LED lights replacing the original bulbs from the first version while there is also a revised printed circuit board with clearly labelled wiring for the motors, track pick-ups and lighting circuits. This simplifies conversion to digital control, but you will still need a basic understanding of digital colour

codes in order to install a decoder. In addition, space is provided in the fuel tanks for a 28mm round speaker, though there are spaces within the body which could be used for this purpose too offering a wider choice of speaker types.

On the track the latest generation motors from Heljan for its 'O' gauge models proved to be the equal of the highly rated Class 33 (HM153) and Class 50 (HM152). Straight from the box our sample ran smoothly and quietly, and it continued to do so following running in and all our tests. We operated the locomotive with analogue control and it happily ran through points, double slips and second radius curves at the head of a rake of parcels stock. The maximum load we ran behind the B-B hydraulic was seven Heljan Mk 1s - a load it also hauled happily up a 1-in-100 gradient.

#### **OVERALL**

The 'Hymek' is an important part of the Western Region transition scene and its return to the Heljan range is great news. These locomotives were versatile mixed traffic engines which were equally capable of hauling long express trains as they were pottering along branch lines. The upgraded mechanism in this new batch will suit layouts large and small and is a great show of strength for the manufacturer in this scale.

If you hadn't already got a 'Hymek' for 'O', and you've always wanted one, this is the perfect chance to expand your collection and we are sure you won't be disappointed with the finished product. ## Hymek' Hydraulics

Lauded by many as one of the best looking of all the first-generation diesel classes, the Class 35 'Hymeks' nevertheless had short working lives, with the last withdrawn almost half a century ago. **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** explains the story of this distinctive hydraulic design.

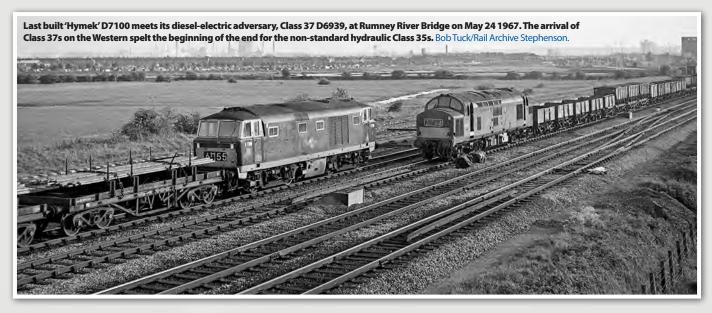
LTHOUGH mixed traffic locomotives such as the LMS 'Black Five', GWR 'Hall' and LNER 'B1' 4-6-0s were the staple traction for much of the railway's work in the early years of nationalisation, British Railways did not include a diesel design of similar capability in its 1955 Modernisation

Plan. Instead the idea seemed to be that smaller locomotives working in multiple would be used. The deficiencies of this arrangement rapidly became apparent and, as a result, arrangements were put in hand for the design of a number of locomotives in the 1,500 to 1,750hp Type 3 category.

By this time the Western Region had already adopted the policy of employing locomotives which used hydraulic rather than electric transmission and it was natural that when a design was drawn up for that region that it should have the same form of mechanical configuration. The new locomotives would eliminate steam in the Bristol area, with the finance for this scheme being allocated in January 1959. With Swindon Works already at full

capacity for construction of the larger and more powerful 'Warships', and the new 'Westerns' also in the design stage, it was necessary to offer the contract out to external manufacturers with the company selected being Beyer-Peacock of Gorton in Manchester. The firm was previously famous for its innovative articulated steam locomotives as well as fulfilling orders for overseas

locomotives, but it had recently expanded its diesel production facilities. Beyer's had formed an alliance with Bristol Siddeley Engines, which had a licence to build Maybach engine products, and Stone-Platt Industries which had a similar arrangement to produce Mekydro transmissions. As a result they were able to offer a package which suited the Western Region's needs.

#### **CONSERVATIVE DESIGN**

However, although the 'Hymeks' were to be diesel-hydraulics like the 'Warships' and the 'Westerns', there the resemblance was to end. A more conservative design was chosen for the rest of the locomotive including conventional frames with welded bodyside members which did not form part of the load-bearing structure. The body plates.

and roof were stress-bearing to assist with the rigidity of the locomotive. Commonwealth bogies were used instead of the lightweight ones previously found on the Class 42 diesel-hydraulics with a suspension arrangement which was entirely traditional in layout yet even with this arrangement the use of the hydraulic format meant the new locomotives came out 30tons lighter each than the equivalent diesel-electric Type 3 being produced by English Electric for other regions.

In appearance the new locomotives benefitted greatly from the input of BR's new design panel and in particular the work of consultant EJM Wilkes. To some extent they set the pattern for several designs that were to follow, including the Class 47, with a two piece windscreen over a lower cab panel which was raked back a little. A white surround was used for the cab, the four-character headcode panel was neatly incorporated into the front end and a dashing two-tone green livery was also used, which produced a very stylish and individual-looking locomotive.

The first of the initial order for 45 locomotives. D7000 made an appearance in May 1961 and was given a test run with seven coaches in tow on the former Midland Main Line through the Peak District. Immediately after that it went to Marylebone where it was exhibited for four days before being handed over at Paddington, two months early.

Further tests were conducted at Swindon before the locomotive was taken into stock and then moved to Bristol for training purposes. D7001 was ready by June and, after the obligatory tests in the Peak District also went off to Bristol, to be followed by D7002-D7054, after which new locomotives began to be allocated to other depots, in particular Cardiff Canton.

By this time 50 more locomotives had been ordered and there was then a final order for another six before production

was halted, as by then it had become clear that diesel-electric locomotives would one day become the standard. Beyer-Peacock had hoped for another 200 orders, but these were never to materialise.

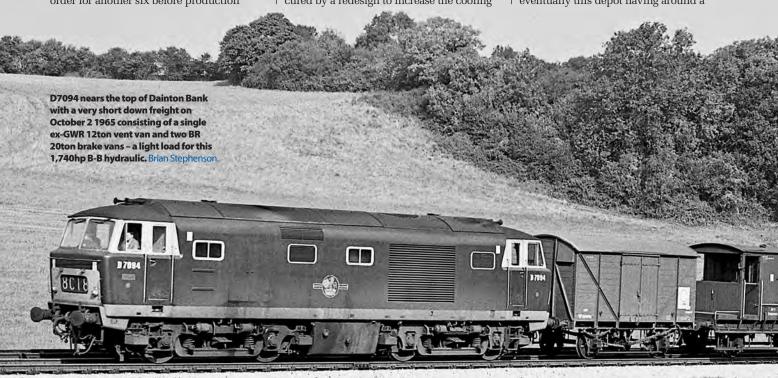
#### **VARIED DUTIES**

'Hymeks' were intended for and were originally deployed on secondary and semi-fast passenger services and goods workings around Bristol and South Wales, but the Western Region soon found out that they could be used on express trains as well. Their allocated duties were expanded to routes including London to Swindon and South Wales where they proved fully capable of running to schedules intended for the top-link 'King' steam engines.

Inevitably, as with any new design, there were some mechanical issues. Overheating of some locomotives in the early days was cured by a redesign to increase the cooling

water capacity but there was a more severe problem ahead when, in 1963, there was a series of transmission failures which required gearboxes to be replaced. There was then some disagreement as to the cause with various remedies being tried until it was discovered that a particular shaft in the gearbox was working at its limit and therefore was failing prematurely. A redesign of both the shaft and its associated gears solved the problem. Later there was an issue with vibrations causing the failure of rubber couplings on driveshafts and this was solved by reducing the vibration as much as possible and also changing the design of some of the couplings.

Overall, the 'Hymeks' proved to be competent machines and in time their sphere of operation spread over a wider area, in particular when a number were allocated to Old Oak Common, with eventually this depot having around a

quarter of the class. Five were also allocated to banking duties on the famous Lickey Incline with a pair in multiple and a single locomotive allocated each day. All three would be used at the same time when a particularly heavy train required assistance.

#### **SHORTENED CAREERS**

As is well known, British Railways had yet another re-think of its traction policy in 1968 at a time when the network was awash with surplus locomotives following the dramatic cuts of the Beeching era. At that time, it was decided that smaller, non-standard classes should be withdrawn, as should less reliable engines with the total number of different classes to be reduced from 28 to 15.

Included in this scheme was a proposal to abandon the Western Region's dieselhydraulic policy, which was partly for political reasons but also because there were technical difficulties in converting some diesel-hydraulic types to accept electric train heating equipment and train air brakes. This proposal was to include the entire fleet of 'Hymeks' which though reliable and performing better than their design specification were to be abandoned due to their engine and transmission arrangements.

Consequently, the region began to receive English Electric Class 37s, displaced from duties elsewhere, and these were used to replace the 'Hymeks' between 1971 and 1975. The largest number went in 1972 when 63 were taken out of service. A farewell tour involving D7001 and D7028 was organised for September 22 1973, but this proved to be a bit premature and the final four survived until March 1975.

#### PRESERVATION BECKONS

Two locomotives, D7076 and D7096, found alternative work at the Railway Technical Centre near Derby but only as dead loads for test trains while three others did pass into preservation. D7017 was purchased for use on the West Somerset Railway and was returned to service in 1977. It was joined by D7018 which also went to Williton, before being returned to service in 1985. D7029 found itself a long way from home at the

North Yorkshire Moors Railway and ran successfully for a couple of years before being moved to the Severn Valley Railway. Of the Railway Technical Centre engines D7076 was to survive, being preserved in 1983, but its partner was broken up for spares as by this time both locomotives had become semi-derelict and in effect a good one was made out of the pair. This engine is now based at the East Lancashire Railway.

The 'Hymek' was certainly a very good design and, had the Western Region been able to complete its plan to fully fit all goods trains and run them at a higher speed, it would certainly have fulfilled its role as a 'go anywhere, do anything' class with consummate ease. In the event its demise was to be due to a change in policy by British Railways rather than any major defects in the design. Had that change not taken place it is almost certain that the 'Hymeks' would have lasted much longer in mainline service than they actually did.









scale) Ford Escort Mk 1 (HM154), Oxford Diecast has delivered its first version of the Mk 2 Escort. This car was introduced in December 1974 when the first

vehicles rolled off the production line. The last was built in 1980.

The Mk 2 Escort here is offered in two-door format in Tango orange. It features a first-year 1975 'P' suffix registration plate together with clear glazing, rubber tyres, silver wheel centres and a smartly finished body. Head and taillights are picked out in appropriate colours while Oxford has done a good job in replicating the panel lines of these cars in 4mm scale.

For those looking to expand their private car collection for a 1970s/1980s layout, the Mk 2 Escort is must-have addition. (MW)



OLLOWING the arrival of the LMS lined crimson version (HM154), Hornby has released its BR period Stanier 'Princess Royal' 4-6-2s for 'OO' gauge. Both 46206 Princess Marie Louise in BR lined blue and 46207 Princess Arthur of Connaught (R3713) in BR lined maroon are now available and we had the opportunity to inspect the latter.

The model follows the same pattern as the model of 6201, but sees detail changes around the

smokebox and boiler cladding while there are also modifications to the valve gear support from the footplating, lower firebox cladding plus the addition of an extra bracket on the frames of the Stanier 4,000 gallon rivetted tender.

These small subtle changes all make a difference and allow Hornby to accurately portray these fine Stanier locomotives in the BR era. Standard features which pass between versions include sprung metal buffers, fine metal valve gear and turned metal wheels, optional front footplate steps and era specific

cylinder drain cocks, firebox flicker and sprung buffers on the tender. The cab interior is fully detailed too while the tender interior has space for a 28mm round speaker and an 8-pin sound or motor decoder to control the locomotive on Digital Command Control layouts.

Decoration meets Hornby's expected high standard with consistent application of the base colours overlaid by crisp lining, clear numbers and lettering plus the all-important late BR crests on the tender sides.



and smooth-running machine capable of handling a scale length train of 12 Mk 1 carriages with ease more than enough for most layouts.

The 'Princess Royal' is a strong addition to Hornby's 'OO' gauge line up and the arrival of the BR liveried examples is sure to turn heads. Plus, if blue and maroon livery aren't your cup of tea, there is a BR lined due to arrive this summer. (MW)





An impressive range of highly detailed hand-made scale model trees is being offered by Primo Models to suit model railway layouts and dioramas. The range comprises 14 different types of tree available in different sizes to suit different scales and positions.

For review we received samples of the Oak, Chestnut, Birch, Spruce, Larch and Pine of varying sizes. All

were neatly and safely packaged in custom cardboard boxes which include a picture window opening to see the model while the tree itself is securely fixed to the base of the box so that it can't move during transit. The box also has a handy scale chart on the side so you can confirm exactly how tall your tree is against its miniature world.

All of our examples featured a superb finish including trunk colour and texture as well as foliage style. The foliage also appeared robust from transport as barely any material dropped from our samples into the boxes or during handling.

One of the more impressive parts about these trees is the availability of sizes. So often model railways feature underscale trees where a



large single signature specimen could give a much more impressive finish. Primo Models trees will do just that. Prices start from around £8 for smaller specimens and rise to the 17cm Oak tree shown here.

We have been thoroughly impressed by the quality and attention to detail in each product. Excellent and available now. (MW)

**EVOLUTION Trains' new** 'N' gauge HOA hopper wagons started arriving in February and we had the opportunity to inspect a trio of these highly detailed wagons.

These high-capacity hopper wagons first appeared in traffic in the late 2000s and are primarily used on aggregates traffic. They feature three underfloor discharge chutes, run on track friendly bogies and can carry up to 75tonnes of stone each. Their sphere of operation is widespread, operating in block or mixed formations with other wagon types.

Revolution Trains (RT) first announced its intention to produce the HOA through its



DB (N-HOA-121), Ermewa/Tarmac (N-HOA-131) and VTG/Mendip Rail (N-HOA-141) liveries. In addition, ten triple-packs have also been produced (priced at £113.95 per pack) - two in each livery - offering

wagons per colour scheme.

Our review samples were finished as 320005 in EWS Construction livery, 320054 in DB red and 81 70 6957000-7 in Ermewa/Tarmac grey and certainly capture the

## FOR GRAFAR 70

EW from Bachmann's 'N' gauge Graham Farish range is this up-to-the-minute version of the General Electric (GE) PowerHaul Class 70 Co-Co diesel in Colas Rail Freight livery.

These US designed locomotives were initially built for Freightliner between 2009 and 2012, with later batches appearing for use with Colas Rail Freight in 2014 and again in 2017.

Bachmann's new'N' gauge model has been updated to reflect the later modified air intake units added to





the bodysides of the Freightliner examples, while Colas Rail Freight's Class 70s carried these from new.

Our review sample was finished as 70805 in Colas Rail Freight's distinctive yellow, orange and black. As with previous releases, the model features a highly detailed bodyshell with the new air intake sitting proud of the bodyside inspection cabinets, as per the prototype. Detailing of this element is well executed as are the numerous inspection covers, doors, grilles and wealth of panel lines, rivets and vents, plus separately fitted handrails, metal buffers and more. Exquisite windscreen wipers are fitted at each end, while the clear windscreens and side windows afford a glimpse of the detailed interior.

Decoration of our sample was superb throughout with a high-

quality evenly applied paint finish and crisp masking between colours. The angular application of the yellow, orange and black colour scheme captures the prototype to a tee even down to the myriad small markings, warning stickers and logos – more than 100 of them! Look even closer on the bodysides and you'll see the fine mesh printing to some of the bodyside cabinets. Colas' bodyside branding also appears to align as it should.

In terms of performance, the model features all-wheel drive and pick-up, twin flywheels, 6-pin DCC decoder socket, directional lighting and a switch underneath to enable the taillights to be turned off. Rapido couplers in NEM pockets and a pack of bufferbeam pipes and cosmetic couplings complete this impressive, colourful package. (MC)



being a one-piece moulding, the body comprises a series of neatly moulded plastic body parts assembled round a central core with bodyside strengthening plates, end door panelling, apertures, pipe runs and levers adding an element of relief to the otherwise flush appearance. It is also worth noting that the VTG/Mendip Rail models (not reviewed here) have additional bodyside strengthening plates (six) and relocated handbrake wheels.

Decoration is equally impressive with a high-quality evenly applied

paint finish, plus printed elements including company logos, numbers, lettering and small embellishments. The hopper interior detailing is painted brown, while small details such as levers are picked out in appropriate colours.

Underneath, the model features discharge door and chute detail, while the low track force bogies are fitted with free-rolling metal wheels with inline brake shoes.

Sprung coupling cams with Rapido

couplers in NEM pockets offer realistic close coupling, which have been designed with second radius curves and above in mind, as the buffers are almost touching when coupled. Each of our samples was subtly weighted and appeared to glide along the rails. A small pack containing air brake pipes for customer fitment is also included.

The HOA is another standout model reflecting the modern-day railway and with a wide sphere of

operation, they are sure to prove popular. Given these wagons tend to operate in lengthy rakes, the addition of triple packs is also a welcome development, offering further variety and realism when recreating a block formation. For those who haven't pre-ordered models, limited numbers are available from select Revolution Trains stockists.

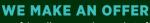

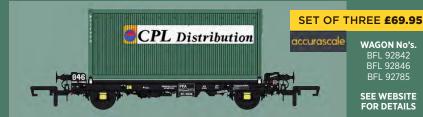

#### STEP BY STEP

#### **INSTALLING SOUND DECODER AND STAY ALIVE IN A HELJAN CLASS 07**







NTRODUCED in 2018, this model by Heljan portrays the Ruston and Hornsby Class 07, which took over shunting duties at Southampton Docks from the 'USA' 0-6-0T steam locomotives. Like them, these distinctive locomotives had character with their short wheelbase and off-centre cab which can really be brought out in the model. A recent 'bargain sale' purchase

character prove troub operations. I stage that I was alive' capacitions.

provided both the impetus and wherewithal to design a sound installation based upon recordings I had already made. The short wheelbase of these locomotives made them ideally suited to the relatively sharp curves on a dockyard rail system, but it can prove troublesome in model railway operations. I decided at an early stage that I would also add a 'stay alive' capacitor if at all possible as part of the sound installation with

this compact 0-6-0 diesel shunter. The spaces available are

Ine spaces available are pretty small so careful selection of components is important. I elected to hardwire a ZIMO MX648 miniature sound decoder to the model's existing wires, adding a cube speaker and a compact but very high capacitance 'stay alive' pack to prevent the short-wheelbase engine from stalling.

There are aspects of this installation which will prove challenging to some so please read to the end before deciding if it's within your capabilities. In particular, your Heljan warranty and that of the decoder may well be adversely affected. On the positive side, it does produce a sound fitted shunter with lots of features which is virtually unstoppable by dirty track!

There is a wealth of exterior detail on these models, more on some versions than others. None are difficult to disassemble though you will need to pay attention to how pipework and handrails are located during reassembly. There are some delicate items in the exact position where you would grip these models during normal handing, so care should be taken when putting any pressure in these areas.

The standard Heljan lighting arrangements for this class are for one white and one red lamp to be illuminated at the leading end, direction dependent. This does not follow normal BR rules for shunting and pilot locomotives, which state that one white and one red, one above each buffer and at each end of the locomotive should be illuminated simultaneously if lights are required by the conditions: all four lamps should either be in the illuminated or extinguished state.

The Class 07 sound project used in the model, available exclusively from Digitrains, enables the lamps to be used correctly as shunting lamps (all operated simultaneously) or as directionally dependent pairs following the Heljan scheme.

The following guide shows how the speaker was added in a lightly modified cab and 'stay alive' in the rear section. It would be straightforward to swap the positions of speaker and 'stay alive' if that better suits your requirements.

#### STEP BY STEP

#### INSTALLING SOUND DECODER AND STAY ALIVE IN A HELJAN CLASS 07



From below four crosshead screws, arrowed, fix the forward and rearward body components to the chassis. Remove these to release the remaining body mouldings.



Before removing these body mouldings, note how the handrails fit to the chassis. This is the front end showing the handrails in their mounting holes



The handrails are fastened to the body moulding and they easily release from their locations on the chassis.





With the screws removed, lift the front engine room cover vertically upwards to remove it. This reveals a high sided cast metal block. The motor is housed here, below a tray which provides positive location for the motor and a small, trough-like space for a 6-pin DCC connector and blanking plate. There's only enough free length for a miniature decoder to be a straight replacement for the blanking plate.



For our installation the rear body section needs to be removed to reveal another section of black metal chassis block.

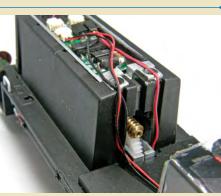


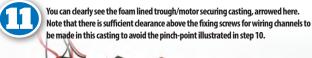
Two screws hold the cab floor panel in place. There is space within the rear chassis block while the 'trough' housing the DCC socket is secured by two screws. Clear tape has been used to secure components and wiring in place.



Remove the cab floor panel after releasing the fixing screws. Wires to the rear lighting PCB can be seen passing through a channel below the cab floor. We will make use of this channel later.











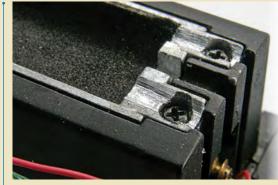
After removing the two retaining screws, I removed the casting to avoid any metal particles/filings from contaminating the exposed gear train so that space for wiring could be made.

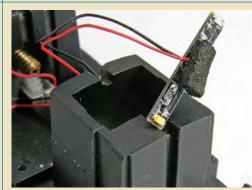

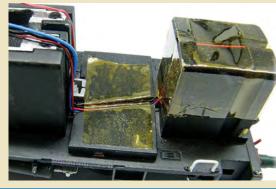
The rear chassis block has a hollowed-out centre. This is large enough to accommodate a standard cube speaker, but I decided to utilise this for accommodating the Stay Alive pack. I've dislodged the black foam pad which helps to hold the rear lighting PCB in its recess.



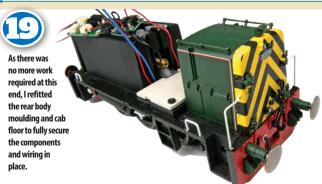
I removed the rear lighting PCB to show it clearly and to give easy access to the space. The latter purpose could easily be fulfilled instead by simply lifting the wires from the below cab floor channel.

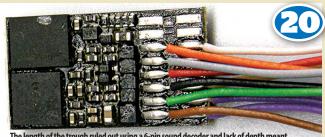


The 'stay alive' pack fits neatly within the space in the rear chassis block in all dimensions while the original wiring channels can be used to take its connections back to the decoder.

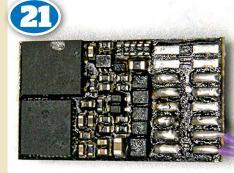


I refitted the rear lighting PCB and carefully embedded all four wires into the channels provided, holding them in place with tape.

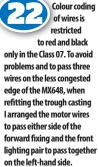


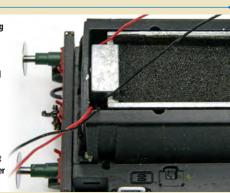


The length of the trough ruled out using a 6-pin sound decoder and lack of depth meant that a miniature Next18 decoder/socket adapter could not be used either. ZIMO's MX648 is thin enough and short enough that it could be fitted if hardwired. Here it is after the necessary removal of the thick heatshrink insulation.



In preparation for soldering the track, motor and lighting wires from the model and those from the optional 'stay alive,' I de-soldered all the existing wires except for the speaker pair. Soldering directly to expensive sound decoders is not for everyone. There is enough free space to cut existing decoder wires short and join them neatly as an alternative method.

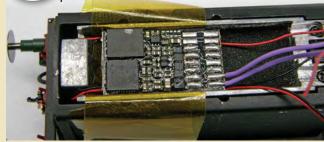

A dryrun proved it would all be possible and a further strip of tape was added before hard wiring began to ensure the decoder was protected from any potential short circuits.





The full sized cube speaker will not fit inside the cab without some minor modification.
The handbrake column and wheel, arrowed, are fixed with pegs and adhesive to the rear wall of the cab.

l inserted a narrow screwdriver into the slot in the column and levered it to break the light adhesive bond and remove the handbrake assembly. The arrows indicate the holes into which the pegs from the handbrake column are





The speaker is a snug fit inside the modified cab and a protrusion from the driving desk prevents it from being inserted higher than the bottom of the cab side windows. The additional space inside the cab will enhance the volume level attained.

normally fitted.

After the speaker wires had been trimmed to length and soldered to the contacts on the speaker, the cab was refitted and pushed down until it dicked firmly into place, ensuring the wires run in the channels. I soldered the wires to the decoder solder pads according to the ZIMO wiring diagram.



After testing that the motor, lighting and speaker connections were all completed, I wrapped the free ends of the Kapton tape over the decoder and trimmed it for neatness. The installation was completed by replacing and securing the engine room moulding, ensuring the handrails slotted correctly into the fixing holes in the chassis.







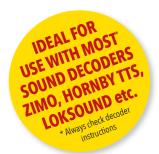

Although high level connectors are also fitted to the rear of this model, there is no additional pipework to complicate the reassembly - just the handrails to locate correctly.

## Immingham DEPOT

The operations in and around the busy port of Immingham are the focus for this impressive 'OO' gauge layout at the Immingham Museum and Heritage Centre.

STEPHEN RICHARDS reveals the story behind its creation.

HE IMMINGHAM MUSEUM and Heritage Centre is a charitable status trust located in Immingham Civic Centre next to the library. Entry is free and running costs are funded mainly by donations from the public.

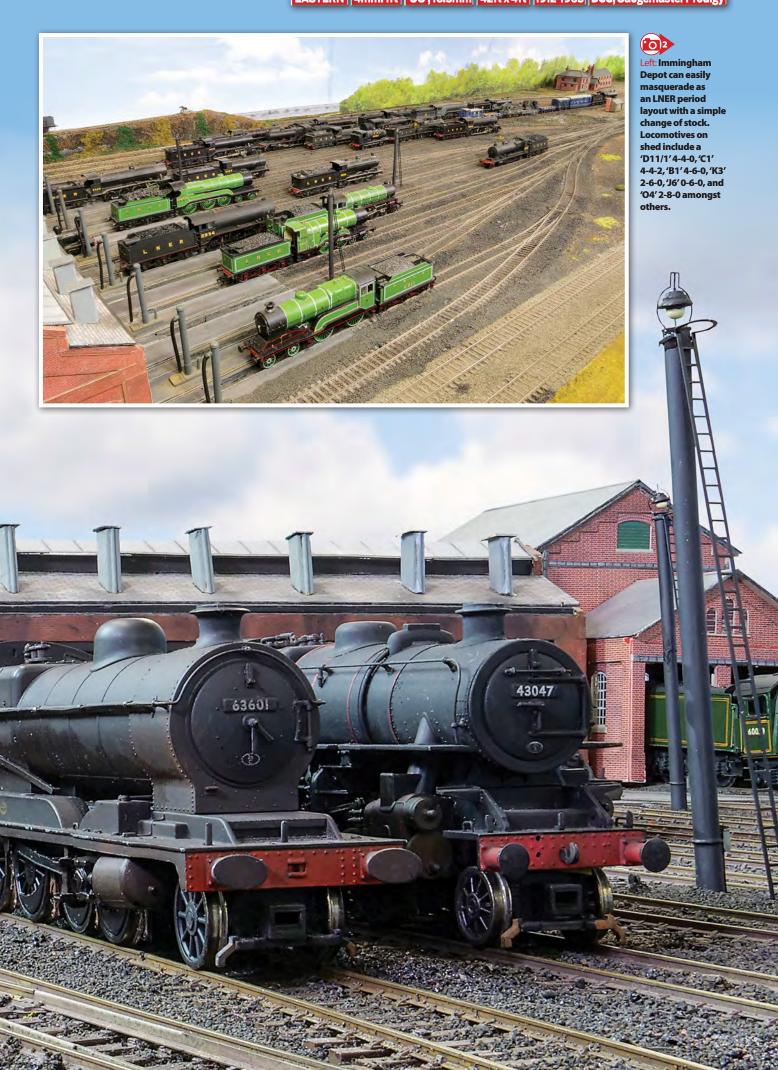
The exhibits in the museum are split into two parts: local history on the ground floor and the docks and railways on the first floor. For the moment, sadly, wheelchair access upstairs is not possible. However, a video of the railway display is shown downstairs.

The displays, memorabilia and model railways tell the story of the railways in North and North East Lincolnshire over the last 100 years and highlight their importance to the area. They show how the railway companies built the docks at Immingham and how the railway

was responsible for the development of the fish docks in Grimsby and tourism in the seaside resort of Cleethorpes.

As well as showing the dramatic development of the Port of Immingham and railway system over the last 100 years, we also highlight the importance of the railways in the port's growth and future. In so doing, we aim to contribute to a sense of pride in our community and its importance to the >>>





local, regional and national economy.

We also aim to celebrate the lives and skills of the workforce and to show how these have changed over the last 100 years. At the same time, we acknowledge the importance of the visionary landowning Yarborough and Heneage families as well as the Great Central Railway's personnel Sir Sam Fay and John Robinson, who designed and built the railway and locomotives, as well as Hollowday who designed and built the docks.

Although this is, of course, a museum, we believe the docks and railways exhibition can also be about the present and the future, not only in terms of the use of the latest technology to retrieve the past, but also to show how Immingham continues to develop. This is important to enable the next generation to be aware of its heritage and take advantage of future employment opportunities.

The exhibition includes two model railways: one 'OO' gauge and the other 'N' gauge. The 'OO' gauge layout, featured here, models Immingham locomotive depot and it is 42ft long and is based on the 1912 track

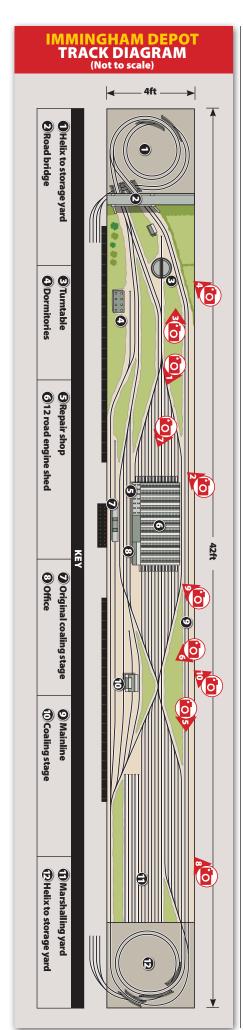

configuration with the 12-road locomotive depot being the centrepiece. There is nearly 1,000ft of track with 90 points. The extensive pointwork is manually operated via rodding from the back of the boards. We are fitting some points with electric motors to make operations easier. Track is Peco finescale code 75 while control is provided via Gaugemaster Prodigy DCC controllers. Some of the 100+ locomotives are fitted with sound decoders.







#### WIDE VARIETY

There are locomotives representative of six decades from 1912 to 1965 from Great Central to LNER and finally to the British Railways steam and green diesel age. There are two main running lines where trains can be run around continuously via a helix at each end and a hidden return loop underneath the scenic section seen by visitors. Locomotives can be prototypically run in and out of the depot and the sidings, along with more than 300 items of rolling stock. Trains are made up into different formations with fish, oil, coal, iron ore and steel being the mainstays of the traffic in the area. Early green Diesel Multiple Units and representative passenger trains can also be seen running on the mainlines.

Just as railways have evolved over time, so has this model with the 1930s 'Cenotaph' coaling tower being added. Whilst we aim to be as historically accurate as possible, some of the pointwork has been altered slightly to make this model workable for us and to enhance the public's enjoyment.

The layout provides two main areas of operation. The double track mainline across the front is run independently and provides a stage on which iron ore and steel trains can pass as well as passenger workings. The helix at each end takes the mainline down a gradient to a hidden set of storage sidings. This arrangement was used to capitalise on the space we had available which restricts the layout width to 4ft.

The depot meanwhile is available for engine movements to take place. The shed itself is a scratchbuilt model of the real building which includes the internal structure, smoke stacks and pits as well. To the rear is the original coal stage with a water tower on top. There is also a Heljan turntable at one end of the depot allowing the spectacle >>>

intended to show the incredible volume of railfreight to and from Immingham on what is one of the busiest freight lines in the country. This will be featured in full in a future issue of *Hornby Magazine*.

There is also an extensive range of local railway memorabilia and a reference library of railway books, journals, maps, photographs, DVDs and videos, together with material relating to the history of the development of the community of Immingham which can be accessed by appointment.

Unusually, we also have a number of television programmes made by local people in conjunction with one of the country's first local television stations, Channel 7, which was based in Immingham from 1996 to 2010.

In the future we are planning train and ship simulators, and multiscreen live-time feeds to show local shipping, air, road and rail movements.

When we are able to reopen again you will be sure of a friendly welcome to Immingham which, for some, may be the largest port you have never heard of – until now!

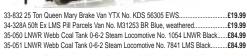

# Immingham Although reilren committee in its angle of the committee of the

Although railway companies were primarily concerned with the transport of goods and passengers their influence spread to many other areas, one of which was the creation of new docks and harbours. **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** takes a look at how the Great Central Railway created one of the most impressive of these, at Immingham in north east Lincolnshire.







NYONE VISITING
Immingham 200 years
ago would have found a
small community nestled
round the historic St
Andrew's Church with a
manor house and no more than 50 other
dwellings. Even at the start of the 20<sup>th</sup>
century the area had been largely by-passed
by the industrial revolution and its 237
residents continued to eke out a frugal
existence on the low-lying but fertile land.

In nearby Grimsby, though, the opposite was the case. The arrival of the Great Central Railway (GCR) to the town had seen a huge rise in traffic for the old docks, which had been an essential part of the North Sea transport system since the 1790s. A fish dock had been added in 1857 and there was further expansion which lasted until the 1880s. By 1900 Grimsby was proving to be inadequate once again and users were urging the GCR to provide new facilities.

As a result the railway company backed the Humber Commercial Railway and Dock Act, which was designed to produce the urgently-needed development, but the increasing size of ships and silting in the Humber estuary caused the bill's promotors to look outside Grimsby for a new site, with their choice eventually settling on Immingham around six miles downstream.

Construction of the new dock began in 1906. The facility was huge, even by early 20th century standards, as it covered more than 1,000 acres of land and measured  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles x 1 mile. There was a lock into the nearby river capable of taking the largest ships then in service along with two jetties, but the main feature was extensive coal handling equipment, which included seven coal hoists with a combined capacity of 400tons per hour. Dock offices and facilities were also built, and these were later joined by a dry dock. All the latest technological devices were incorporated, including hydraulic power for the hoists and an electrical generating station.

Despite the huge size of the undertaking >>>

it was completed in six years and was formally opened by King George V on July 22 1912 with lavish celebrations. Lunch was provided for 1,418 guests and such was the expected demand for hot drinks that two small railway locomotives were brought in to provide the hot water! One unexpected occurrence was the bestowing of a knighthood on Sam Fay, the chairman of the Great Central Railway, in gratitude for the finance and backing which the railway company had provided towards this great scheme.

#### **NEW LINES**

As might have been expected the building of the docks resulted in the construction of a number of new railways to serve it. The main connection was provided by the Humber Commercial Railway which ran from the New Holland line, north of Ulceby, to the Eastern Jetty, where a passenger station was provided.

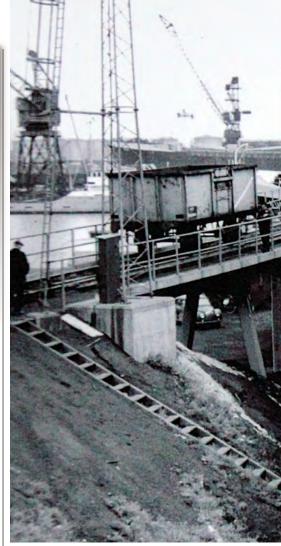
The Grimsby District Light Railway was built originally as a contractor's line but was then converted to become a railway which could bring dockers to and from work. Parallel to this the Grimsby and Immingham Electric Railway which ran from Corporation Bridge at the Alexandra Dock to Immingham was built. This railway was actually more like a tramway, though largely running on reserved tracks and its inception caused the withdrawal of the steam railmotor services which

Extensions to the tramway soon made this the preferred method of travel for dock workers and so popular did it become that at shift changeovers convoys of six cars at a time would run. The Barton and Immingham Light Railway was the final piece of the jigsaw which was intended to provide a link between Hull and Immingham via New Holland.

The dock company also built an engine shed in the south eastern corner of the development, with this initially having facilities for 60 locomotives. Here the Great Central's locomotives were turned, coaled and watered and facilities were also provided for engines allocated for internal work. This shed developed and became the Immingham shed we know today which at its peak had an allocation of 120 locomotives, with 12 stabling roads, a turntable and massive concrete coaling tower.

Goods began moving through the new dock some two months before the official opening, largely because there was a high demand for coal as a result of a recentlysettled strike and soon millions of tons of various products began to flow through the facility. The north quay was set up for handling pig iron with ten mobile cranes being provided while, shortly after the opening, a large reinforced concrete grain silo was completed, which could hold 20,000tons of grain. All products moving

were then running on the Light Railway.



in and out of or round the docks were moved by rail and the dock company laid 170 miles of tracks and sidings to service its customers' requirements.

The new Immingham docks had cost £2.6m, a considerable sum in those days, and it also spurred an increase in the size of the town itself. New housing was erected, of which some was of the pre-fabricated iron-clad type, while others were traditional terraces. Much of this was to house the families of the railwaymen who were drafted in to work in the new facilities. However, it wasn't until the 1930s that the town expanded to the size which it is today.

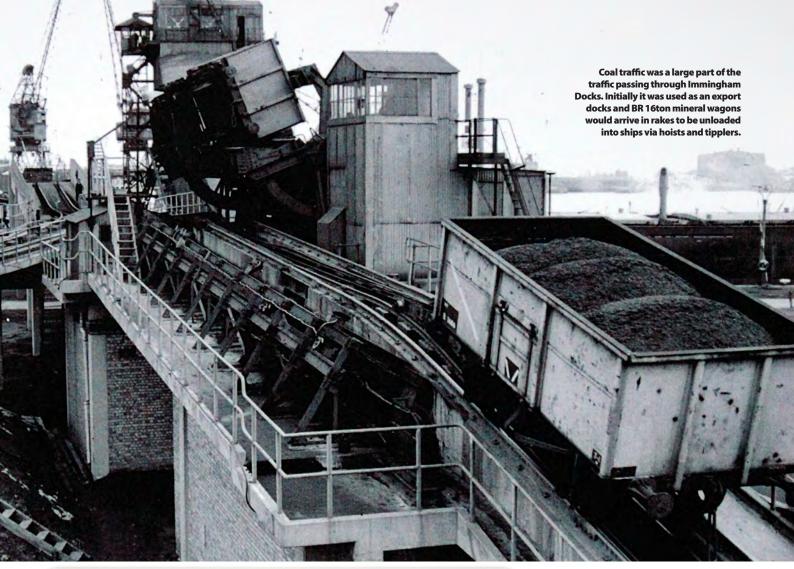
#### WARTIME CHANGES

Only two years after the docks were completed Britain was plunged into the First World War and part of the complex was commandeered for use as a submarine base. A number of D-Class boats were allocated there which patrolled the North Sea. Post war, a portion of the facility was adapted for use by cruise ships and liners, while general freight traffic reached a vast tonnage - particularly with the shipment of coal, which arrived in numerous block trains each working day. Immingham again became a naval base during the second conflict, being the navy's headquarters for the Humber region, and acquired a number of anti-aircraft batteries for its protection, although this didn't stop it being hit in a number of air raids.

While most of British industry was undergoing a recession in the 1950s

Immingham Docks continued to expand, cleverly being adapted to suit the needs of a changing world. In 1950 a fertilizer plant was added to the facilities available and seven years later construction of a new dry dock was commenced, finally opening in 1960. Another sign of changing times came in 1966 when the port obtained its first ro-ro ferry terminal, which was used by Tor Line on services to Amsterdam and to Gothenberg.

Good rail access to Immingham also led to the site becoming one of the prime locations in the UK for the storage and processing of oil products. The first oil terminal was located west of the dock entrance in 1969 and served the newly-built Lindsey and Continental refineries. Processed products left the site by tanker trains and served locations all over the north of England.

Two nationalised industries collaborated in the building of a new bulk terminal which opened in 1970 at a cost of £11.5m. The National Coal Board wanted to expand its facilities for the export of coal while the British Steel Corporation needed to import more steel products and raw materials. An iron ore terminal was added a few years later designed to service Scunthorpe steelworks. Unfortunately, the export of

coal was to last for only a few more years but this traffic was to some extent replaced with a new facility for handling liquified petroleum gas, for which a new jetty and an underground storage facility was provided.

#### **LATEST CHANGES**

During the 1990s Immingham was modernised yet again and further facilities were added for ro-ro ships and for handling containers, while in a bizarre twist one of the quays was extended so we could import coal - the very material that the docks had been built to export in the first place! Later a biofuel plant was added and extra land acquired so that imported motor vehicles could be stored.

Throughout all these changes the railway has remained pivotal in the future of Immingham. Today the site still generates substantial traffic, although not as much as used to be the case, and trains still run from there to many other parts of the country. Immingham engine shed successfully made the transition from the steam to the diesel age, having a new facility provided for modern traction in 1966, which at one time had 90 diesels allocated to it as well as 35 shunters, but in recent years has become mostly a stabling and storage point.

Immingham docks owes its very existence to the forward-thinking management of the Great Central Railway and, despite being built at the tail-end of the industrial revolution has managed to successfully evolve so that it meets the needs of an ever-changing and modern world.

# Parcels plan

A quiet weekend and the right mindset were the perfect combination to get an Ian Kirk'O' gauge Stanier parcels van kit off the ground. **MIKE WILD** explains all.

To give strength to each side a 14mm strip of 1.5mm plasticard was added along the lower edge on the inside of the van followed by a 3mm strip of the same material at the top.

REALLY enjoy building kits of any kind, but sometimes I don't have the right mindset for it. At other times though, the wind is in the right direction and I'm in that mode where I want to build something for myself and that was exactly where I got to during March.

The kit in question is an Ian Kirk Models LMS
Stanier 50ft parcels van I bought in 2019. It
had been languishing in my drawer of projects
because I was unhappy with the roof. Fortunately
I'd found a source for a replacement aluminium
roof, but with one thing and another I hadn't
actually placed the order with Sidelines to get
the part I needed delivered. Finally I made
the call and within a couple of days the new
roof was here and I wanted to get going with
the van to extend the parcels train which will
run on my garden railway this summer.

The kit consists of injection moulded parts while the bodysides come as separate panels which allow multiple vehicle types to be assembled by using common components. It's a clever system and once you understand the logic of the body it is quite straightforward to assemble.

I'd already built the bogies, cleaned up the floor panel and trimmed it to size which meant that with the roof now available I could start working through assembly of the body. I began by building up one end with the first pair of side panels which gave a solid corner from which to work. Following the instructions, a strip of 1.5mm plasticard was then glued along the length of the floor against the side so the next panels could be added. It was then a simple

case of repeating the process and ensuring the right pieces went together in the right order.

Having completed one of the sides I added another 3mm deep strip of plasticard along the upper edge of the van for strength before repeating the process on the other side and adding the end. Extra braces were added across the width of the van using 2mm square section plastic rod leaving the way clear to start building up the chassis.

Now I have a fully assembled van with the basics of its underframe in place. I'm going to get a new set of castings for the dynamo and vacuum brake reservoirs to improve upon the plastic mouldings with the kit while I have used NMRS Models LMS round head buffers (Cat No. C002) at each corner together with a spare pair of Heljan screw link couplings to allow the van to be coupled to a train. While I'm waiting for the underframe parts, I'll add wire handrails to the bodyside as appropriate and then get it primed and painted into BR maroon.

It might have taken me a while to get started, but the pleasure in building a kit is the satisfaction of creating something of your own. Even part completed I'm pleased with what I have achieved so far and it runs nicely too. It has also reminded me of how many other projects there are waiting for my attention. On my workbench at the moment I also have a Parkside Trestle wagon nearing completion which will soon be followed by an MM1 Models GWR Fruit D and many others. Keep watching Staff Projects and our online blogs for more on my latest modelling ventures.

For those that don't recognise me, I run the YouTube Model Railway channel 'New Junction' and now I'm living the dream of working with model railways as Hornby Magazine's latest recruit.

Like most people the hobby was passed onto me from family members, in particular my uncle who has a loft-based layout. When I was knee high, I used to pester him to go into the loft to run the railway. In fact, as I write this my cup of coffee is sat on a coaster which is a photograph of me in that same loft looking far too happy with myself! Now I'm all grown up when I visit my uncle and aunt's house, they barely get a 'Hello' as I go straight upstairs, yep you guessed it, to the loft!

After a happy train filled childhood the hobby faded away and working life took over – a familiar story for many. I remember standing one cold January day many years later in the retail shop I owned with my partner after working over the Christmas period thinking that we should really treat ourselves to a present. My choice wasn't difficult and on our next day off we went

to have a look at what was on offer in the sales. I managed to find myself a cheap Hornby starter set (which I bought primarily for the track and controller) containing a BR lined blue model of newbuild 'A1' class 'Pacific' 60163 Tornado with Twin Track Sound. It instantly got me hooked again.

It didn't take long before I moved into my own loft to begin a new layout project. I grew up in Newcastle-upon-Tyne and, having travelled by train down the East Coast Main Line (ECML) on HSTs and Class 91s to see family when I was younger, it was the obvious choice for my layout theme. I've also included a heritage branch line and station to remind me of my days volunteering at the Great Central Railway near Leicester.

I posted photographs of the layout on forums to answer questions which led to more questions and eventually it was easier to post a video. Four years later New Junction, which is 'OO' gauge, now has a lower level with an 'O' gauge loop leaving the loft well and truly full to the rafters. I've posted at least one video per week for the last couple of years and the journey has been fantastic. From the audience interaction, meeting many likeminded people,

being invited onto the real railways and many other experiences off the back of having a YouTube channel has been and still is amazing.

Looking to the future, a recent house move has presented a space almost twice the size to create an all new version of my railway (New Junction 2 or New New Junction) and a space for model train film making. You can be sure to see progress both through the magazine, our YouTube channel and through New Junction's own, plus you never know what other surprises I have up my sleeve.

I've been working closely with the Hornby Magazine team for the past few months creating online and video content and I'm proud to now officially become part of the team to take the magazine forward as their new Associate Editor. I'll be the man behind and in front of the camera creating content to take *Hornby Magazine* into a truly multimedia experience where you can enjoy videos which backup extensive content that Mike and the editorial team have planned for the coming issues. Plus keep an eye out for me at model railway exhibitions across the country later this year including the Great Electric Train Show and Warley this autumn. Em
