ORNBY has revealed LBSCR 'Terrier' 32635 Brighton Works in Stroudley 'improved engine green' as the next exclusive Hornby Collector Club model for 'OO' gauge. The model is only available to Hornby Collector Club members and is a follow up to the soon to be released Club model of Bluebell Railway Wainwright 'H' 0-4-4T 263.

The model of 32635 portrays the 'Terrier'

as it was between January 1959 and January 1963. It is limited to 500 units with features including a 6-pin decoder socket, three-pole motor, cab interior detail, coal rails on the bunker and intricate Stroudley 'improved engine green' livery. It is due for release in August 2020 priced at £84.99 (Cat No. R3849).

Hornby reveals

Hornby has announced that it is working on a 'OO' gauge model of the Open Third carriages hauled by Rocket on the Liverpool and Manchester Railway for release in September this year!

The new 'OO' gauge model will be priced at £16.99 (Cat No. R40141) and was designed and tooled at the same time as Hornby's centenary model of Stephenson's Rocket. The new Open Third will feature etched

brass components and separately fitted parts as well as turned metal wheels with spoked centres. It will employ the same coupling system as the closed carriages included in Hornby's Rocket train packs which are currently entering the market.

Hornby says the carriage was originally planned for announcement in September, but the date has been brought forward to coincide with Hornby's 100 year celebrations during July. "The

best laid plans of mice and men", quipped Simon Kohler, Marketing run of the Rocket and coaches is about to enter the market." Hornby is expecting high demand for the new LMR open coach due to manufacturing constraints.

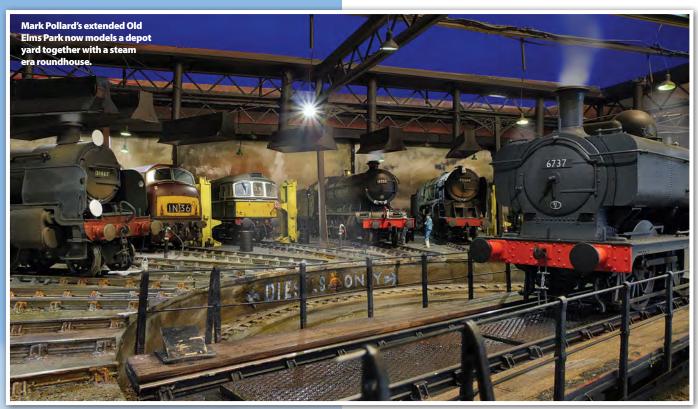

'00'CLASS 20/3



ACHMANN has revealed factory decorated samples of its eagerly awaited all-new 'OO' gauge Class 20/3 models covering DRS and Harry Needle Railroad Company colour schemes.

The Class 20/3s have been designed from the ground up to offer a brand-new tooling suite for these refurbished locomotives. Features include separate pipework on the bogies, picked out in white, metal sandpipes, etched metal steps, sprung buffers, optional full bufferbeam detail, directional lighting, NEM coupling pockets and turned metal wheels.

Power is provided by a centrally

mounted motor providing drive to both bogies while lighting can be switched between day and night modes. Like the recent Class 117, 121 and 159, the Class 20/3s feature a PluX22 decoder socket and a speaker is included in each locomotive to simplify sound installation.

Models planned for release cover 20306 in original DRS blue (Cat No. 35-125), 20311 in Harry Needle Railroad Company orange and black (35-126) and 20312 in DRS 'Compass' (original) colours (35-127). Prices are set at £164.95 per locomotive with release currently anticipated in December 2020.

HELJAN CLASS 56 FOR 'O'

Heljan has released the first images of a hand-painted sample of the 'O' gauge Class 56 Type 5 heavy freight diesel-electric. The model has been painted by Brian Daniels to show the engineering sample in BR'large logo' blue.

Heljan says work is already underway to refine and correct areas of the model as part of the development process and it is currently expected to go on sale in early 2021. The price per model is £699 and features are set to include twin five-pole motors with brass flywheels, directional lighting, working

roof fans, sprung buffers, sprung working screw link couplings and Heljan's latest 'DCC Friendly' central Printed Circuit Board (PCB).

Eight versions are planned for release modelling the class, unnumbered - unless otherwise stated, in BR blue (Cat No. 5600), BR 'large logo' blue (5601), BR Railfreight grey (5602), BR Railfreight 'Red Stripe' (5603), BR Railfreight triple grey (5604), 56101 *Mutual Improvement* in BR Coal Sector triple grey with weathering (5605), 56110 *Croft* in BR Construction Sector triple grey (5606) and Loadhaul black and orange (5607).

Dapol adds smoke generator to Class 59!



Dapol has added the option to have a DCC operated smoke generator fitted to its factory sound-fitted 'OO' gauge Class 59s.

The all-new model of the heavy freight Type 5s are now due in the second quarter of 2021 with a feature-rich specification including independent control of No. 1 and No. 2 end lights on DC through switches, DCC control of independent lights, train and

light engine modes, day and night headlamps, independent cab lighting and now the option for a smoke generator which will simulate exhaust output on initial acceleration. The factory sound models with smoke generators must be pre-ordered with Dapol stockists before August 14 2020 and the feature is available on all liveries.

Prices are set at £154.95 for DCC ready versions, £184.95 for DCC fitted models and £219.95 for

£250 for DCC sound fitted Class 59s and £285 for DCC sound and smoke equipped locomotives.

The initial production run models 59005 Kenneth J Painter in Foster Yeoman silver (Cat No. 4D-005-000), 59103 Village of Mells in ARC grey and mustard (4D-005-001), 59206 John F Yeoman in DB Schenker red and grey (4D-005-002) and 59204 in National Power blue (4D-005-003).

Heljan has revealed decorated samples of its forthcoming 'O' gauge model of the GWR AEC railcars with release expected in the final quarter of 2020. The new model has been produced with the support of the Great Western Society at Didcot.

The new railcars will feature directional lighting, straightforward DCC and sound installation options through the use of a 21-pin decoder socket, interior lighting, working screw link couplings, sprung buffers and a discreet mechanism. The tooling also caters for differences in windscreen wiper design and bogie drive shafts between GWR and BR era models.

Lighting modes include separately switchable train identification marker and tail lights and separate



control for cab and saloon lighting. These functions can be managed by a DCC decoder or, for analogue users, via switches under the body. Helian says its new 'OO' gauge GWR AEC railcars will have the same lighting features.

The full list of livery options covers No. 22 in GWR chocolate and cream (Cat No. 1900), No. 29 in GWR post-war chocolate and

cream (1901), W21W in BR crimson and cream with a dark grey roof (1902), W20W in BR crimson and cream with a white cab roof (1903), W32W in BR green with white cab roofs (1904) and W26W in BR green with a dark grey roof (1905).

LEADER AND DHP1 FOR 'OO'



R MODELS has revealed bold plans to develop two historic prototype locomotives for 'OO' gauge - Bulleid's radical vision for the future of steam design - Leader - and Clayton's experimental Rolls Royce engined diesel-hydraulic DHP1.

Both projects were revealed on July 4 offering new additions to KR Models' portfolio which includes current projects to produce a ready-to-run model of unique gas turbine prototype GT3 and 'Fell' 2-D-2 diesel 10100 for 'OO' gauge.

Expressions of interest are currently open for Leader and DHP1 with prices estimated at £170 and £165 respectively for DCC

ready options. DCC sound fitted options are proposed for both in KR Models' prospective information.

Leader was Bulleid's last big project for the Southern Railway and the only one of the five to be completed was delivered into British Railways service in 1949 after a three-year build at Brighton Works. It was designed to show a modern future for steam locomotive design and featured driving cabs at each end, a central fireman's position and had an 0-6-0+0-6-0 articulated wheel arrangement.

36001 operated on test trains, but was deemed to be a failure by 1951 and was withdrawn and scrapped. No ready-to-run model has been produced of the historic design.

PAINT EASY THE HARDER WAY

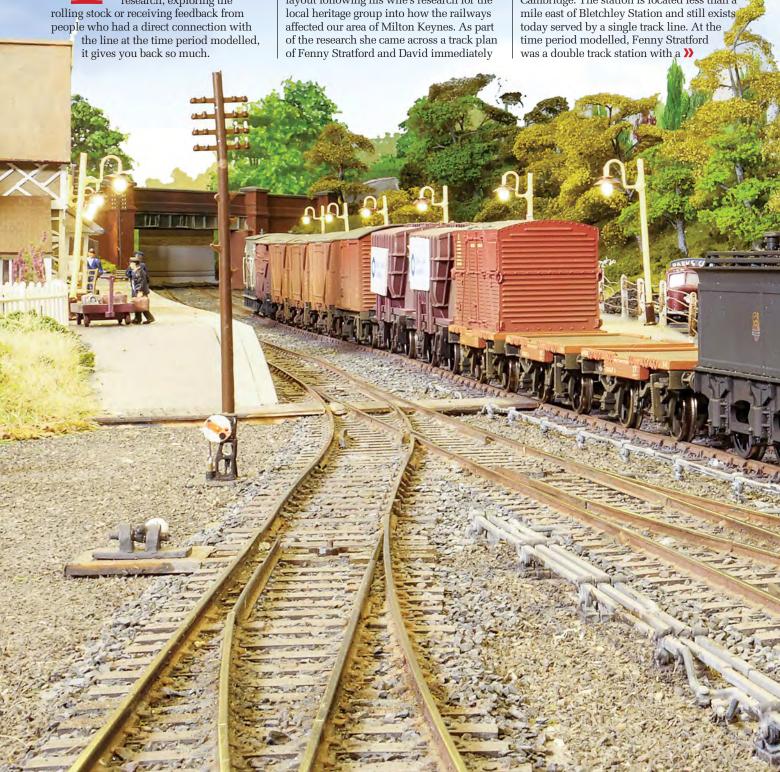
Now rather a backwater, in the 1950s, this pretty station was so much busier, like many others. **PETER ELLIS** describes how he and David Court recreated part of the 'Varsity Line' in 'OO' gauge for exhibition display.

When David approached me to ask if I would like to be involved in building a 'OO' gauge exhibition layout of Fenny Stratford as a joint venture I accepted without hesitation. David first had the idea of building the layout following his wife's research for the local heritage group into how the railways affected our area of Milton Keynes. As part of the research she came across a track plan of Fenny Stratford and David immediately

thought this would make an excellent exhibition layout modelled in the late 1950s. Fenny Stratford is a wayside station on the old London & North Western Railway 'Varsity Line' linking Oxford and Cambridge. The station is located less than a mile east of Bletchley Station and still exists today served by a single track line. At the time period modelled, Fenny Stratford





number of sidings and an active timber yard.

A copy of the working timetable demonstrated the variety of traffic running through the station at the time. This included; through passenger expresses, stopping passenger trains, through freight workings between the East Coast, West Coast and Midland main lines and local stopping freight trains.

RESEARCH

The internet yielded many sources of information. The National Library of Scotland online map service provided a layout of the station from the 25in:1 mile Ordnance Survey maps series. The signal arrangements were gleaned from the Signalling Record Society at www.s-r-s.org.uk, and the Britain From Above site and Google Earth Pro provided information on the adjacent area. Further research threw up a very detailed 1940 London Midland & Scottish Railway (LMS) survey of the track and station building plans which were drafted at the time the Down platform was moved.

Some of the original buildings such as the station building still remain, but many like the signalbox, gate keeper's cottage and Rowland's timber yard were demolished long ago. Fortunately I was able to prepare CAD scale drawings of all the buildings and structures from the numerous images found on the internet and early photographs taken by colleagues at the MKMRS club. However, initial searches for photographs of the buildings along Simpson Road, required to paint the backscene as it was in the 1950s



drew a blank. Then months later out of the blue a link to the British Film Library produced stills from a wartime propaganda movie showing a tank transport convoy moving down this stretch of Simpson Road!

With the track plan to hand I used Anyrail to prepare the scale track plan across the five scenic boards. The only alteration to the plan involved the repositioning of the Grand Union Canal 150 scale yards west so the scenic boards could be assembled in Dave's garage.

CONSTRUCTION

With the detailed track plan agreed, we started work on the baseboards. For this we turned to our friend at the club, Wayne Web, who had built baseboards for his exhibition

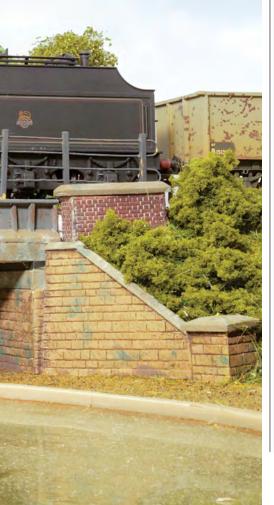


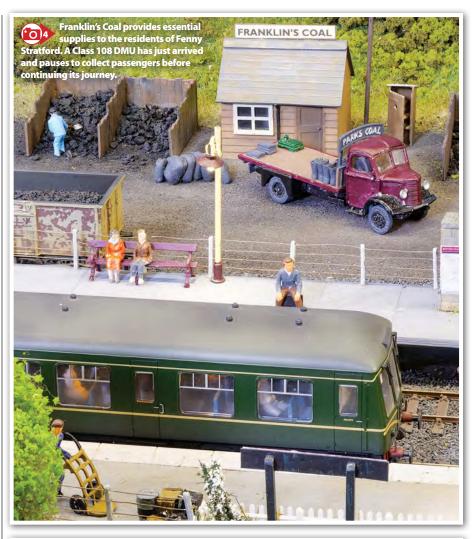
layouts including Dentdale and Brinklow. He designed the individual boards and cut all the pieces required so all we had to do was assemble them like a flat pack. The boards are constructed from 12mm plywood for the sides and 9mm ply for the tops. The legs are 44mm x 20mm softwood fitted with steel corner sockets and adjustable feet. The finished boards are both light and very robust. The five scenic boards are all 800mm deep and joined together add up to 5m long overall. Individual boards varied in length to avoid any board joints around pointwork.

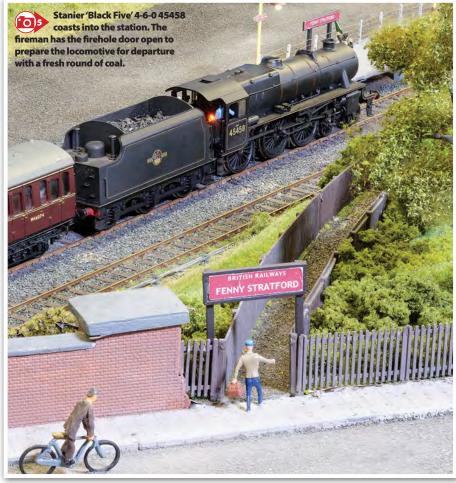
At each end of the layout there are 1.2m (4ft) long boards to take twin track cassettes with a total of four cassettes at each end to hold the rolling stock. The cassettes are made of plywood and fitted with brass rod and tubing at both ends to locate the cassette and provide electrical connection.

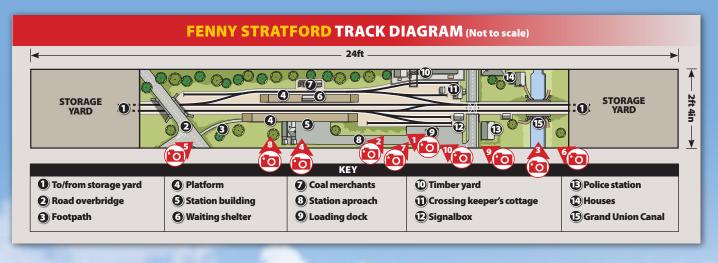
The track is generally Peco bullhead rail. At the time of laying the track the Peco bullhead points were not in production so we modified Peco Code 75 streamline points following the guidance in the leaflet produced by DCG Concepts. The resulting appearance and reliability of the points was greatly improved.

LAYOUT CONTROL

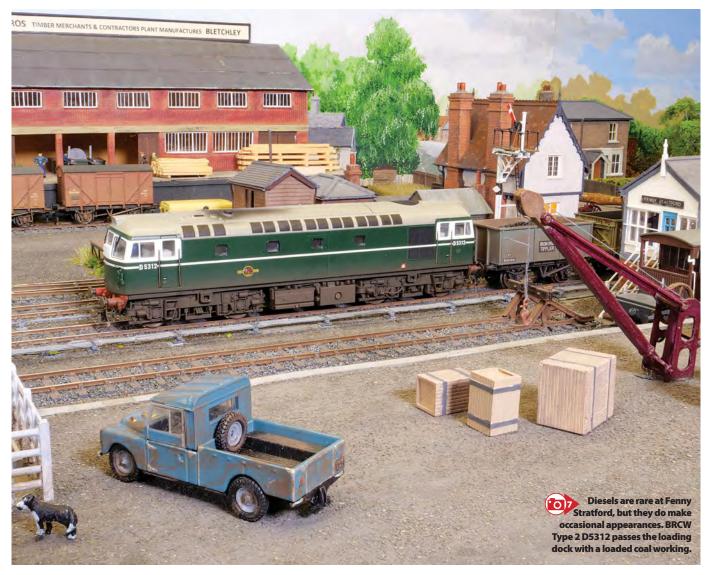












Models. The signals and the crossing gates are operated by mini digital servos controlled by a Megapoints Controller.

With the track laid, the task of wiring the layout was undertaken by David. Each board was wired as a single unit, complete with a DCC bus, 12 volt DC bus and servo leads for signal and crossing gate operation. The boards are interconnected using Tamiya connectors for the DCC bus and 12-pin D connectors for everything else. Once all the wiring of the boards was tested and completed the layout was assembled and testing began. A chance to run trains at last!

We decided that we did not want to operate the layout from a fixed mimic panel and therefore opted to use the JMRI software and utilise the Routes and WiThrottle functionality it provides. The operators each have a Kindle wireless tablet with the Engine Driver app installed and this allows the operators freedom of movement while running the layout. We have tested the setup at three exhibitions to date and at the largest we found the setup slow to respond at times. This was probably due to the large number of mobile phones and Wi-Fi routers in the vicinity of the layout. After some head scratching we resolved the problem by linking the laptop and modem by Ethernet cable rather than by Wi-Fi. We are now very pleased with the way the setup works.

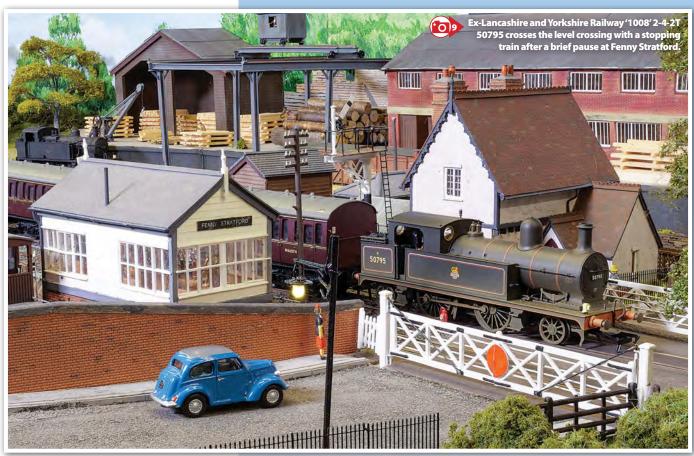
BUILDINGS AND SCENERY

Only a few buildings on the layout still exist today. These are the station building (Grade II listed), the police station and the canal cottages. We had to rely heavily on internet searches to find photographs where possible showing the buildings as they were in the 1950s. With the photographs and surveys to hand I set about preparing CAD drawings of all the buildings and printing 4mm scale templates to aid construction.

The vast majority of the buildings and structures are scratchbuilt on plain Plastikard carcasses overlaid with embossed Plastikard stone, brick, tile and timber sheets which were then painted and weathered. The station building has some intricate details such as the gable bargeboards and side canopies. 3D CAD drawings were produced which we then had 3D printed. Dave has produced an excellent model of this ornate building. >>>

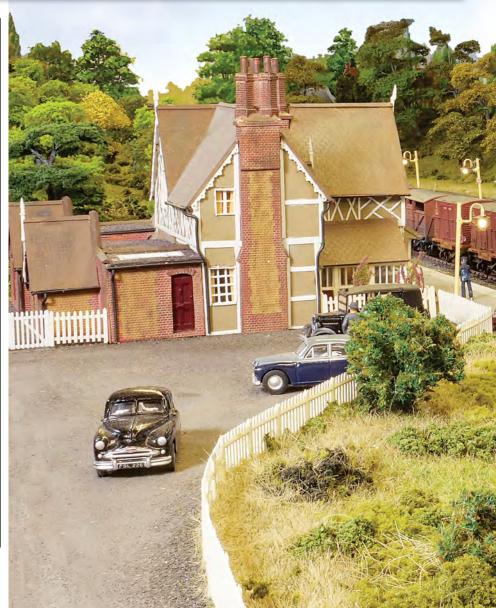


We have used a few kit buildings such as the coal office, platelayer's hut and goods shed. However, all have been modified in some way to fit our requirements. Most of the buildings have been fitted with lighting.

The enjoyable process of bringing the layout to life was started by adding the scenery. The Stag Road bridge framed the west end of the layout and carried the old Watling Street over the railway. Once this was built and in place the contours for the rest of the layout were set out. The embankments were constructed using the tried and tested method of lacing card strips over card or plywood formers and covering this with newspaper soaked in PVA glue. This was then painted dark brown and covered with Woodland Scenics scatters and static grass to build the look we wanted. The roadways and yards were made using very fine ash ballast sprinkled onto wet PVA surfaces. Once dry the areas were lightly sanded with fine emery paper to produce the weathered effect we were looking for.

The level crossing gates to Simpson Road were constructed by modifying a Wills kit. Following a number of collisions between trains and gates at exhibitions a failsafe system has been built in. Microswitches have been fitted to the gate servos to isolate sections of track around the crossing as soon as the gates move from the open position.

The Grand Union Canal at Fenny Stratford includes a set of locks that have the smallest rise of any lock on the canal network, a mere 12in. We were able to include an accurate representation of one of the gates on the layout. The canal was built using a plywood base that was sanded and painted a mixture of green and brown colours which were



blended to give that particular canal colour. Any gaps were sealed with PVA and the area was then filled with two layers of Deluxe Materials Solid Water. We thought that we had fully sealed the base beforehand, but we missed a tiny pinhole and finished up with a pool of resin on Dave's cabin carpet!

We commenced making trees for the layout but soon realised that we did not have enough hours (or patience) to build the number of trees required ourselves in the time available before the first exhibition date. We therefore subcontracted these to another of our friends at the MKMRS club (Jacqui of Ceynex Scale Model Railway Trees). She did a brilliant job and made wonderful trees to adorn the layout.

Commercial photographic backscenes are popular at the moment but we felt they would not meet our requirements as far as reflecting the continuation of the canal and Simpson Road. I therefore took on the challenge of hand painting the backscenes using acrylic paints.

ROLLING STOCK

The stock operated on the layout is mainly Bachmann with a scattering of Hornby items with motive power representative of LMS and BR designs. The roster currently includes an ex-LMS '4F' 0-6-0, 'Crab' 2-6-0, 'Jinty' 0-6-0T, '1008' 2-4-2T, Ivatt '4MT' 2-6-0 and 'Black Five' 4-6-0 amongst others, as well as BR Standards. However, there is scope in the future to include LNWR and London and North Eastern Railway stock which ran through from Cambridge. We run a mixture of passenger services with Mk 1 corridor coaches for the through express trains as well as suburban stock for stopping passenger services. In addition there are a number of express goods and stopping freight services to keep the interest going. The majority of trains are headed by steam locomotives with a Diesel Multiple Unit serving local passenger services to Woburn Sands and Bedford.

We initially based operations on a Working Timetable for the 1950s but found that under exhibition conditions a simpler arrangement of working with eight fixed cassettes of stock worked best.

David and I are very pleased with what has been achieved in building our first exhibition layout, in terms of realism, interest and quality. Our biggest accolade came from a neighbour of David who came to see the layout. She explained that as a child she would catch a train from Fenny Stratford to a school in Bedford and the model brought back many memories and was exactly as she remembered it. When exhibiting the layout we have had similar positive comments from many others who in some way have had connections with Fenny Stratford station.

We started work on the layout in September 2016 and we were pleased to have completed the layout in time to show at the MKMRS 50th anniversary exhibition in February 2019. We are now looking forward to taking the layout out to exhibitions again in the future.

'VE been on the '59' trail from the very start - big locomotives hauling massive trains through attractive landscapes are very much part of my agenda. For a good decade and a half my family would spend at least one holiday a year at a cottage in rural Somerset, and most days would embrace trips out to Berkeley, Frome or Witham Friary to see some hardcore '59' action.

In the mid-90s I can remember the excitement of seeing the newly delivered National Power Class 59/2s on acceptance trials at Ferrybridge, and many years later I had the thrill of flying in a helicopter over Whatley and Merehead and being astonished by the near-unimaginable scope of the Mendip quarrying operations.

In the meantime, I've bought every ready-to-run Class 59 livery colours to GBRf's stylish reworking of European returnee Yeoman Highlander 30-odd years later. So yes, you could say I am a fan.

All of these models have their origins in the Lima design of 1989 one of its better efforts, it's generally felt, especially if you do something (as Hornby subsequently did) with its 'pancake' motor bogie. It doesn't have sound or lights or lots of other things we take for granted nowadays but it certainly gives the creative modeller a flying start.

The Class 59, more significantly, shows a key aspect of Hornby's 100-year corporate history – the ability to absorb other ranges and successfully bring them into the company fold. The struggling Italianbased company was acquired in

2004 and many of its products have subsequently been relaunched in the Hornby 'Railroad' range.

In this piece I want to show how Hornby has built on these foundations, launching a steady stream of new Class 59 liveries that came into being in the years following the takeover. Despite its all-new motor bogie, 8-pin DCC socket and other enhancements, the Hornby'59' is far from perfect but it's rich in potential and this is reflected in its low price point and the opportunity it offers for making further improvements. That's what I aim to look at here. Etm

- » Sap green acrylic paint
- » PVA glue
- » Hairspray

OR THIS DEMONSTRATION I'm adding the scenic modelling materials over a 6mm piece of MDF board set at an angle of around 45 degrees. The board is attached to wedge shaped pieces of card glued to the baseboard which gives my demonstration piece of embankment stability. When building an embankment for your railway you are more likely to have a sturdy flat top which carries the track. The edge of the embankment can be attached to the flat top and can be made using a variety of materials including thick card, chicken wire, Kingspan or polystyrene sheets. All are excellent materials as they are all lightweight and readily available.

The first step in creating the foliage for this embankment is to cover it in a base layer of material, I'm using 'Raw Grass', which is teddy bear fur. The fur is trimmed using sharp scissors to create shorter grasses, but some of the fibres are intentionally left longer. Some of the longer fibres (25mm) will become long grasses and others will be used as the stalks for nettles and other tall weeds. After the grass has been trimmed it can be coloured to give a pleasing grass tone. Sap green acrylic paint is diluted at a ratio of around one part paint to five parts water and applied to the fabric by hand - rub the paint into the fibres to make sure it works its way to the bottom of the material. Some patches can be intentionally left free of paint to represent drier areas of grass. Allow the paint to dry then using a comb or fine brush, comb the

fibres to separate them to give the look of fine stalks of grass. The fabric is glued in place on the embankment using neat PVA glue.

A sheet of paper with small holes cut out is used to create a mask which can have paint sprayed through. A couple of small areas are sprayed with aerosol paint to darken them down and then sprayed with hairspray and given a light sprinkling of scatter added over them to produce the look of tall nettles.

Next, to produce the brambles on the embankment a small piece of rubberised horsehair is pulled apart to open up the structure of the fibres and given a very light spray of black aerosol to tone the colour down slightly. The rubberised horsehair is sprayed with hairspray and sprinkled with a suitable coloured scatter.

To add some variation to the textures on the embankment small low growing shrubs are made in the same way as the rubberised horsehair brambles but this time I'm using 'Canopy' for the branches, which is much finer in appearance and a good contrast to the rubberised horsehair. Add the bushes to the embankment and work them into the grass to give the impression that they are growing there as opposed to simply being placed onto the surface of the grass. The whole embankment doesn't need to be fully covered in foliage – in steam days in particular, short grass was the norm to reduce fire risk. When you're happy with the results, spray it with scenic glue or diluted PVA to fix everything in place.

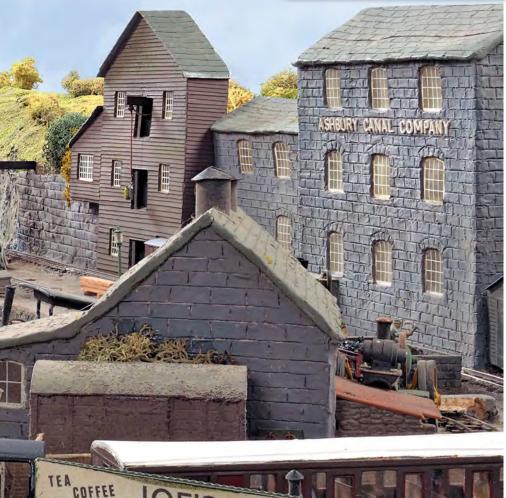
Lying almost forgotten for years, this vintage 'OO9' gauge layout was resurrected by its home club Astolat Model Railway Circle and is now returning to life for a brand-new audience.

HE Astolat Model Railway Circle in Guildford was formed by four friends, including the esteemed Robert Alexander, Baron Schutzmann von Schutzmansdorff (Bob Symes to you and me) who originally met at the Guildford Model Engineering Society. The Circle they formed celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2017. It has had a number of clubrooms during its existence which have included an old scout hut, rooms in the local Territorial Army centre, a disused factory hut which needed renovation, a second stay in the scout hut, a church basement and, since 2013, members have met in the Barge Building Shed at the National





Ashbury Wharf, its first layout, which started life as a simple oval with siding in a dockside setting in 'OO' gauge and was called Wanborough Docks. Most of the Circle's fictitious layouts since then have been named after local villages or landmarks.

The layout was exhibited at a number of shows over the years, with its final showing in 2006 at the Rural Life

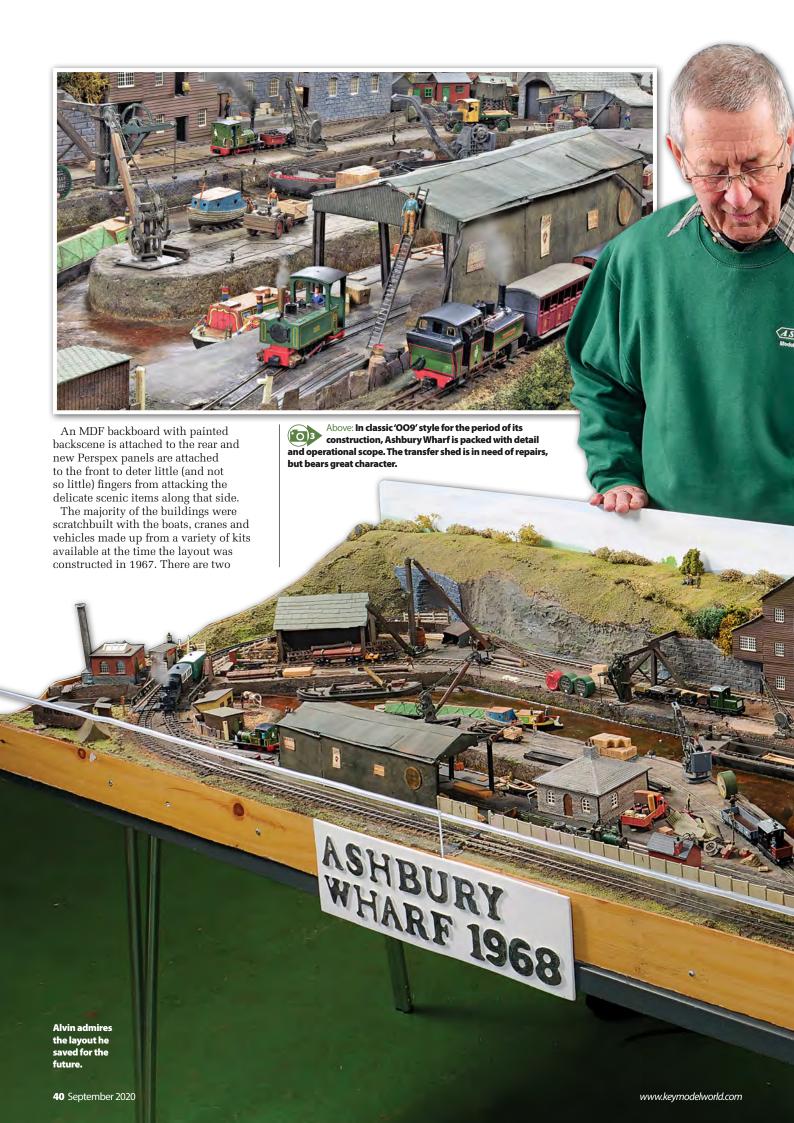
Trust's Dapdune Wharf in Guildford. By good fortune the Circle still has

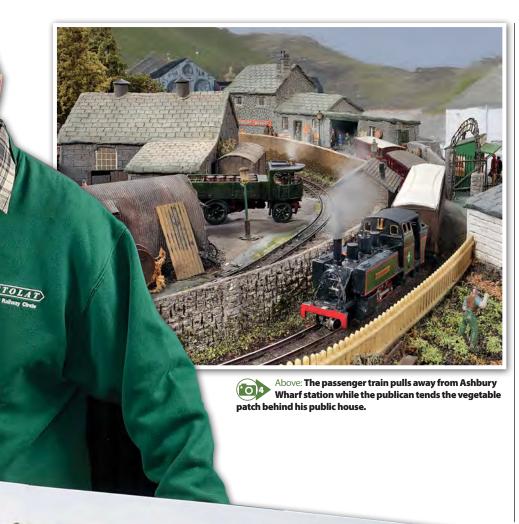
Museum, Tilford, Surrey, at which point it was beginning to show its age.

At the time Astolat had started to construct a large 'OO' gauge layout and, as storage was required for this new venture, it was decided to dispose of Ashbury Wharf. Fortunately, one member, Alvin Hale, decided he could give it room and arranged to house the layout in his garage where it languished

unloved and unseen for several years.
When looking for something to celebrate the forthcoming 50 years of the Astolat Model Railway Circle, Alvin suggested we bring the layout out of retirement. It was retrieved from its temporary home, the cobwebs were dusted off, and it was given a quick scenic overhaul. The old Perspex guards were removed and a new backscene created. The yellowing grass areas were refreshed with mixed green scatter and minor repairs were made to fences and buildings.

Appropriately the layout was shown in its fresh guise as Dapdune Wharf at the 50th Anniversary celebrations at Astolat's Open Day in August 2017 albeit non-operational as the control panel no longer existed and the wiring underneath was shambolic. It also appeared in its static guise at the 50th Annual Exhibition in January 2018.





loops of track; the outer loop disappears behind the back scene to a one track 'storage yard' before reappearing at the station. The inner loop runs around the dockside with sidings and also has a connection to a locomotive servicing area.

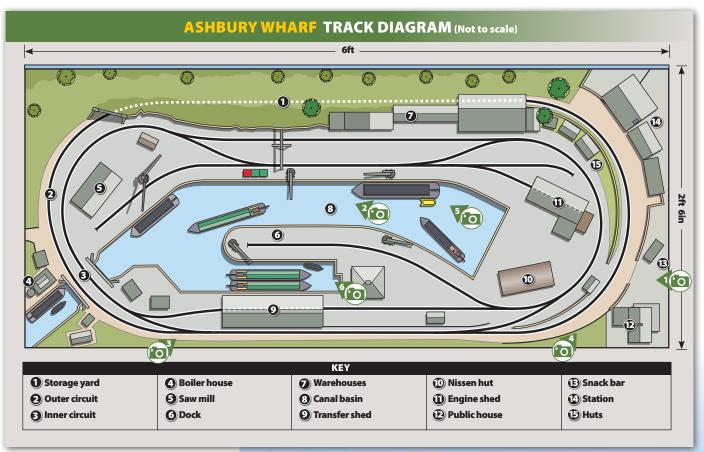
Around the dockside there are warehouses and storage sheds for holding the goods carried in the barges. The timber yard has a vertical boilered steam engine to power the derrick crane for unloading timber from the barge. There is a horse drawn barge leaving the docks and this is followed by a smaller motor-powered barge. At the entrance to the docks, the canal company has its name on the archway which was made by soldering up a wire framework to which the individual letters were mounted.

The canal water surface was created from a painted base with many layers of varnish which have discoloured over the years and several foreign objects have got into it to be permanently incorporated. The colours that have resulted make for a very grimy and polluted waterway – so reflecting the situation at the time it is set.

RENOVATION

By summer 2018, the number of members modelling in 'OO9' had increased enough that an 'OO9' group had been organised and permission was sought from the committee to see if they could renovate the layout and bring it back to some form of operational status. The committee approved the suggestion, originally just so that it could be operated at the Circle's exhibitions and open days.





When testing started it was found that all the Hammant & Morgan point motors worked first time. It has, of course, been necessary to replace the bird's nest of wiring below baseboard level, build a new control panel and make repairs to the scenery as necessary, and this renovation work will continue in 2020.

As with any restoration work there was a dilemma as to whether items should be repaired or replaced, and in this case whether the track should be relaid – it had taken a beating at the board joints - and it was originally thought best to relay it all with modern track work. However, as the original had been handbuilt – both track and pointwork - it was eventually decided that only those pieces of track which were completely unsalvageable should be replaced and the new sections blended in to the old.

Buildings and the backscene are gradually being restored as necessary, keeping as much of the original as possible.

OPERATION

Running the layout initially proved an issue - as mentioned above, track ends at board joints left a lot to be desired, but now that these have been addressed the team has managed to get first one loop and then the other running and the layout has been a regular attendee at exhibitions locally with trains running on a 'round and round' basis. The next stage is to renovate the pointwork to allow a more realistic operation of sidings and locomotive facilities.

As Astolat now has several members whose main interest is modelling 'OO9', there is plenty of stock to choose from when operating the layout. Ashbury Wharf was



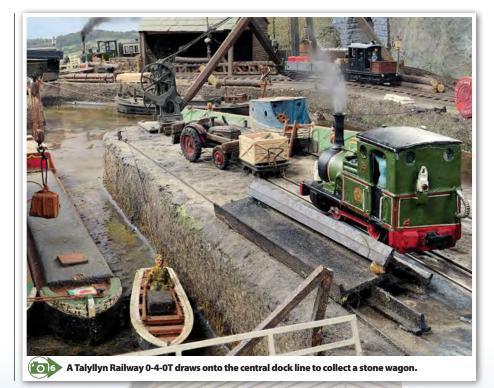
first seen again in operation at the Circle's annual exhibition in January 2019 and the open day in August the same year. It attended four local exhibitions in autumn 2019 and is available for exhibitions in the future when it is safe to do so.

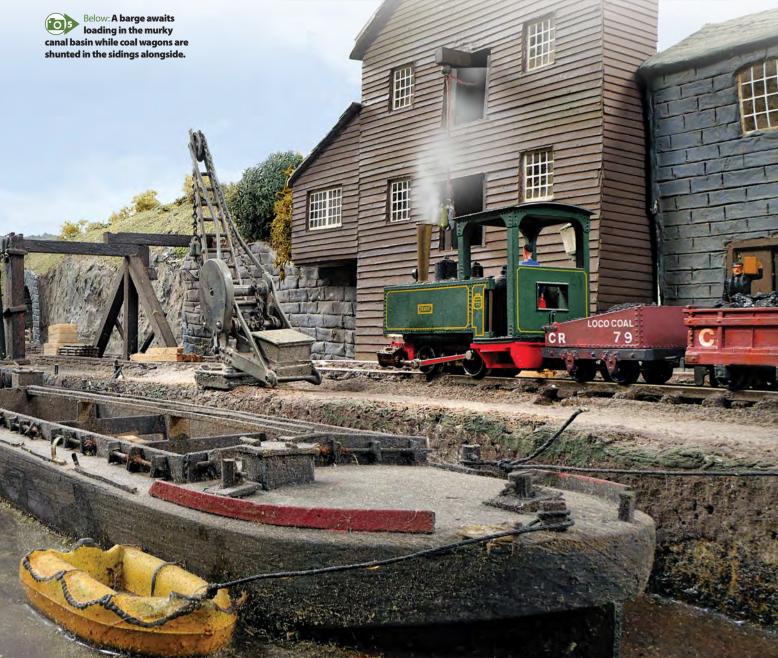
It has been a joy to find former members of the Circle at exhibitions who will come up to chat about the layout, what they remember of it and all the things that went wrong over the years. Why is it they always remember the things that went wrong?

NEXT STEPS

Astolat Model Railway Circle has a couple of other layouts on the exhibition circuit including Whitmoor ('N') and Priorsfield ('OO'), and is in the middle of the construction phase for the new 'OO' gauge layout Savernake which is to be 24ft x 12ft and feature the GWR and MSWJR stations at this famous location — the first 'real world' layout it has built.

SCRATCH

Learning the skills to use card and plasticard to build your own structures means you can build unique items to enhance your layout. **PAUL CHAPMAN** shows how to build a simple brick built sub-station using wallet friendly materials.

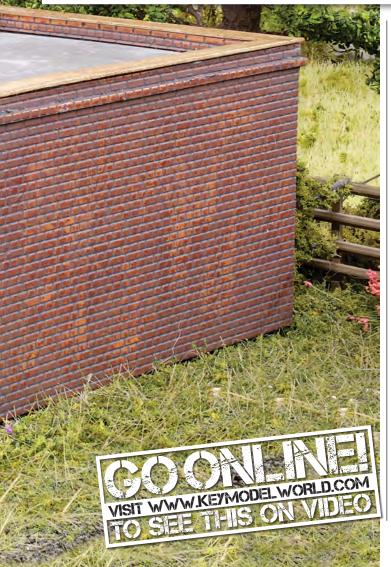


BUILDING For beginners

This structure has been built in 'OO' gauge but the same methods can be used to produce similar buildings in both 'N' and 'O' gauge.







CRATCHBUILDING is a great pastime. Some find it daunting, but in this feature and accompanying video on *KeyModelWorld.com* I'll be showing how to build a simple substation building which can be used on any layout from any region.

The first step in any scratchbuilding project is to have a reference photograph to work from. You can use this to work out dimensions by using generic dimensions for features such as doors of 28-30mm tall and 10-12mm wide. This can be used to work out other measurements from the structure. Another method is to count the bricks to establish how tall a building should be. Four bricks is around 1ft in height, or 4mm on a 'OO' gauge model, 7mm in 'O' gauge or 2mm in 'N' gauge.

Once you have the dimensions, graph paper can be used to map out the structure and allow for extra details including downpipes, brick details and overlaps.

The central materials for this project are mounting card for the inner structure and brick embossed plasticard for the outer finish. You can use plastic for the full structure, including the internal walls - with the Maquette range supplied by Albion Hobbies being an ideal source of plastic sheet and strip in various profiles and thicknesses.

When cutting parts, remember to take into account the depth of the materials used. For example, the sides of this building were cut 4mm shorter than the overall length so that they can sit in between the front and rear walls. It is also worth including internal strengtheners to stop the building warping in the future.

Assembly uses Deluxe Materials Roket Card Glue for the main structure and also for attaching the brick plasticard outer layers. Our plasticard came from the Slaters range for the brick finish.

Painting uses Humbrol and Revell brick colour enamels for the base colours followed, once they have cured fully, by an acrylic wash of dark grey to represent the mortar courses and weathering.

The finishing touches for this project are a scratchbuilt door made by scribing plasticard and a piece of 800 grade grey sandpaper to make the felt roof style finish.

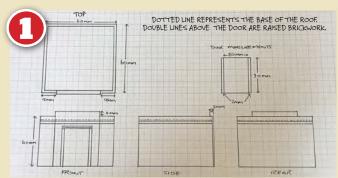

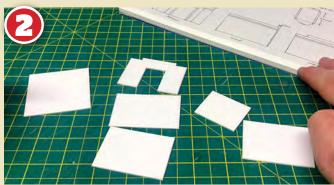

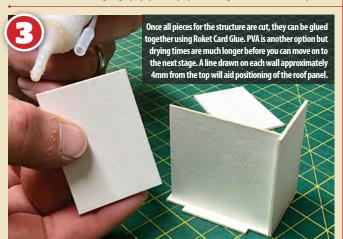
SCRATCHBUILDING STRUCTURES FOR BEGINNERS

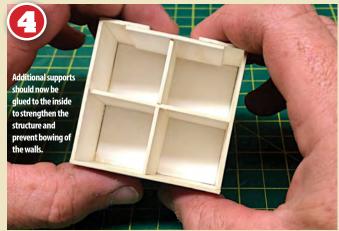


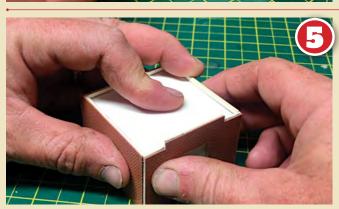
It's useful to have photographs of your subject to enable you to gauge measurements and for referral when it comes to painting and detailing. From a picture we can ascertain the size of the building by counting brick courses or knowing the dimensions of a door in '00' gauge and calculating the remaining measurements from this. Once known, these measurements can be used to create a scale drawing on graph paper. Our project building will measure 60mm square.



From this drawing the basic shapes can be cut out to create the building. The side walls are cut 4mm shorter than the front and rear to take in to account the 2mm card being used for the building shell. A smaller piece of card will be glued behind the door portal to allow the door to sit within the wall. The larger square piece is the roof.

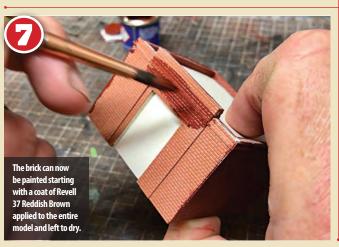






Once dry it's time to wrap the material with brick plasticard. Cut the sheet at a 45 degree angle with a craft knife to create a mitred joint — doing this means adding 2mm to the length of the sheet to allow an overlap. The sheets are glued to the structure again using Roket Card Glue.





This is followed by Humbrol 70 Brick Red which will add further relief to the brick colouring. Working in small areas at a time, using a piece of kitchen towel, the paint can be blotted to reveal the previous coat below. Additional pressure will reveal the original plasticard giving three colour

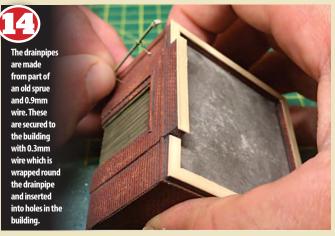
The capping is made using plain plasticard cut just slightly wider than the wall to allow an overhang. Cut diagonally at each corner, glue and repeat the process round the entire building.



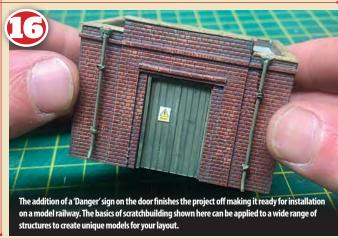
The door is made using plain plasticard. Cut to the size of the opening, planks can be scribed at 2mm intervals using the back of a craft knife. The door frame can then be applied using 0.5mm square plastic strip. Start with the top section and then repeat for both sides.

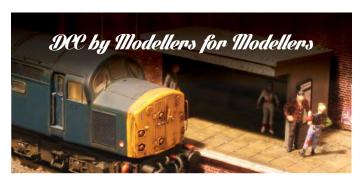

The transition from hydraulics to diesel-electrics is the subject of **BRIAN TAMPLIN'S** 'OO' gauge layout, which depicts the spectacle of the Western Region in the 1970s to grand effect in a modular format.

S A CHILD GROWING UP in the North Kent area using public transport in the 1960s and '70s, the railway was mostly third-rail Electric Multiple Units with occasional glimpses of Class 33 and 73 locomotives with even

rarer sightings of Class 71s and 74s. My grandparents lived near Slough and close to the main lines out of London Paddington to Reading and beyond. I found a favourite railway overbridge where I could photograph and take down the numbers of classes 31, 35, 37, 47, 52 and, later, 50 and 25, not forgetting

the Class 117 and 121 Diesel Multiple Unit (DMU) suburban services. Another excellent place to view these was at the servicing point at Ranelagh Bridge on the approaches to Paddington. An idea was beginning to gel to build a similar setup in model form but, as I was in the process of building and exhibiting other layouts,

the subject was put on the back burner.

I have been a member of several model railway clubs in my area and by chance joined the West Kingsdown MRC in North West Kent in around 2006. I found some members were constructing their own personal layouts with 4ft x 2ft baseboard units using 6mm MDF laser cut frames, and by using dowel locators and common track centres could connect up in modular format. There are four such layouts within the club which can either be used as independent units or, with additional 180-degree curves at each end and similar boards as a storage yard to the rear, used as a twin circuit layout. With a couple of these units going spare, the idea of forming Gravesdown South re-emerged basing it somewhere in the West Country.

Given the overall baseboard area of 8ft x 2ft, the only criteria was to have track centres of 115mm and 165mm from the front edge to match other boards at each end. To add variety to the plan I opted for an island platform between these with a trailing crossover at each end to aid running round trains. This then gave me a substantial area remaining for sidings.

indicated for fuel deliveries. I based my track plan on this layout. From here on further construction bears no resemblance to the actual location, there are more accurate representations in model form, and the layout is designed to be a display for my own stock or to suit part of a club arrangement. The layout's name came about with the combination of my local town and the current club I belong to and the 'South', because there were already club layouts with 'North' and 'West' in their names.

CONTROL

Standard Peco Code 100 Streamline track laid on a bed of 3mm cork is used throughout. Medium radius points have been used to save space bar a pair of three-way points which gain a few more precious inches for the sidings they serve. All are insulated frog types.

After installing a few inspection pits, SEEP and Peco point motors were fitted and wiring for various sections was done for analogue control. DCC was being experimented with at the club and all crossover rails between the two circuits were fitted with insulated fishplates to enable stock to be run with either system, but not at the same time. As time progressed other layouts opted for DCC control and the NCE Powercab system, but as far as this layout was concerned, section switches were retained to allow analogue operation. When it comes to running with DCC, all switches are set to the 'ON' position so the whole layout is live. Eventually, the whole layout will be upgraded to the traditional

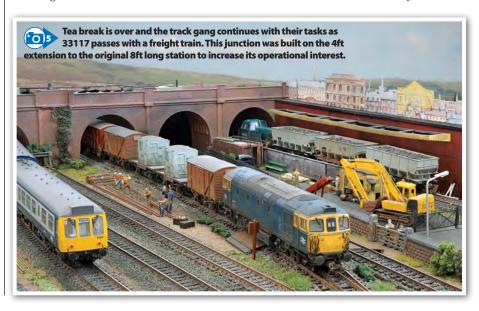
two wire bus system, but that is for another day at the moment. Following testing, the track was ballasted using the diluted PVA via dropper and 'N' gauge ballast method.

SCENERY

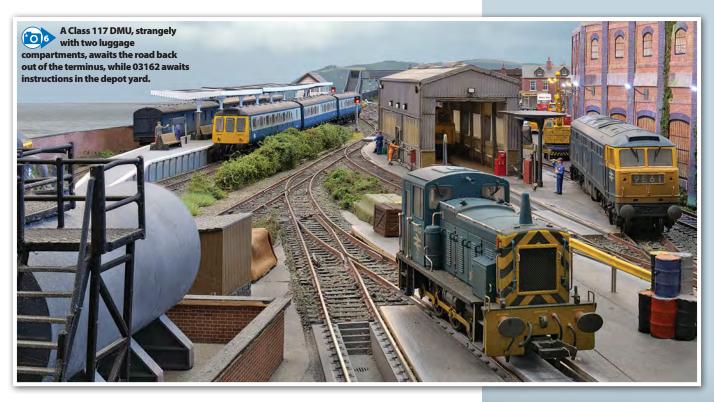
A backscene of MDF was installed along the entire length of the layout. The switch panel is built within the layout area and to disguise it a simple plywood box was attached. This in turn was covered by a Scalescenes Warehouse Kit, using the printed brick paper walls as a wall base and then adding further layers as required to produce a solid low relief unit.

Having a collection of various 'OO'

die cast vehicles, the remaining clear baseboard area would be more suited to a town setting. A collection of low relief Metcalfe Terraced House kits were made and used for the rear of the scene, and the area in front of these became a main road, station approach and car park.

when installing new venetian blinds some trimmings were left over, made of softwood and around 1in wide and high in varying lengths. These could be easily shaped and when stacked up just reached rail level. Site office units provided the usual staff facilities and parking, with fuelling points and storage tanks adapted from Knightwing kits.

I am a great believer in recycling serviceable parts from rummage and brica-brac boxes when found at exhibitions for a few pennies, and buildings on the layout are no exception. I'm not a great lover of scratchbuilding and find Hornby station building and signalbox shells (the type that use the printed overlays) are always in plentiful supply at these events and provide a solid structure to be clad in material of choice. Suitable brick papers were used on this occasion, using Wills builder sheets for the roofs, and for originality even provided a balcony for the signalbox. The island platform is accessed from the main station building via a subway, and Hornby station canopies with the cast columns are used extensively throughout. Lineside structures

and outbuildings were made from various kits together with suitable accessories and population which continue to be added. Worthy of note is our Border Collie Sam in miniature.

OPERATION

By now the layout was being exhibited in the South East. Locomotives being used in BR blue livery included classes 03, 08, 25, 31, 33, 35, 37, 45, 47, 52 and when available Class 22, both types of 'Warships', and prototype *Falcon*. Passenger services are worked by DMUs and Mk 1 and Mk 2 coaches - limited to three vehicles due to the platform length. Freight

traffic was limited on this type of layout and included assorted parcels vans, fuel tanks, and the occasional infrastructure train. By now co-operator and assistant Phil Carter and myself were finding the operating restrictive, and the need for an additional station approach section would add purpose and further movements.

The plan drawn up was to provide a double track main line route from the station to the storage yard and introduce an additional exit from the service area and one platform to an off scene industrial area further up the line. This would introduce a greater variety of freight vehicles needing to be brought into the longer platform and run round to be sent up the main line or vice versa. It also created reason for light engine movements to and from the locomotive servicing area to provide further interest. Freight content could now expand to include general merchandise, china clay, milk and oil traffic.

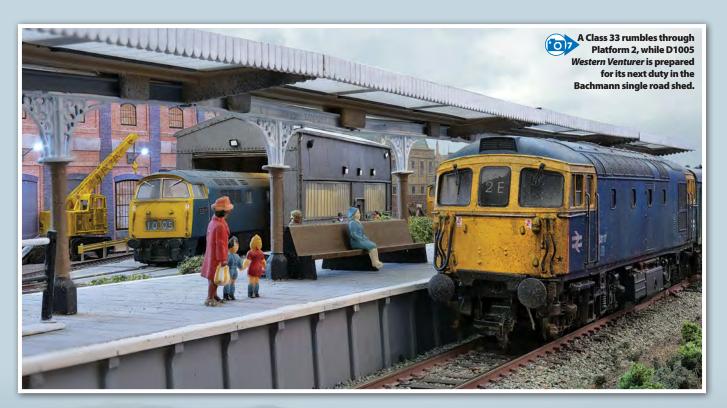
A further 4ft x 2ft board was built using the traditional methods with track laid, wired, ballasted and road access to suit

> the main layout. To disguise all these additional tracks entering the storage yard a combination of the Hornby three-arch and single arch bridge units were used to span

the entire width and, suitably weathered, do look the part. A Metcalfe service station and car sales area fill one area on the board, with a parking and a workshop area the other.

I thought more could be made of this latter area, and after a lot of trials came up with an operational feature using the Tri-ang/Hornby Operating Ore wagon set of old. Originally designed for a full wagon to be drawn across the unit to unload and continue on its way, I discovered that after the wagon unloaded it was forwarded.

just enough to re-latch the operating door and could be drawn back only with slight resistance. Proving this could work I only had a limited area to work with, and to add an operational feature I came up with the arrangement of using the bridge unit only with an access track from the storage yard. This would not interrupt any other movement on the rest of the layout, other than if someone was brave enough to bring a few of these loaded wagons from the storage yard to the station, run round the train and back to the storage yard to unload with one of the doors accidentally opening en route. If all goes well, the wagons should discharge through into a suitable container under the unit. It provides some amusement to both operators and the public when exhibited - especially if it goes wrong!

ADDING THE DETAILS

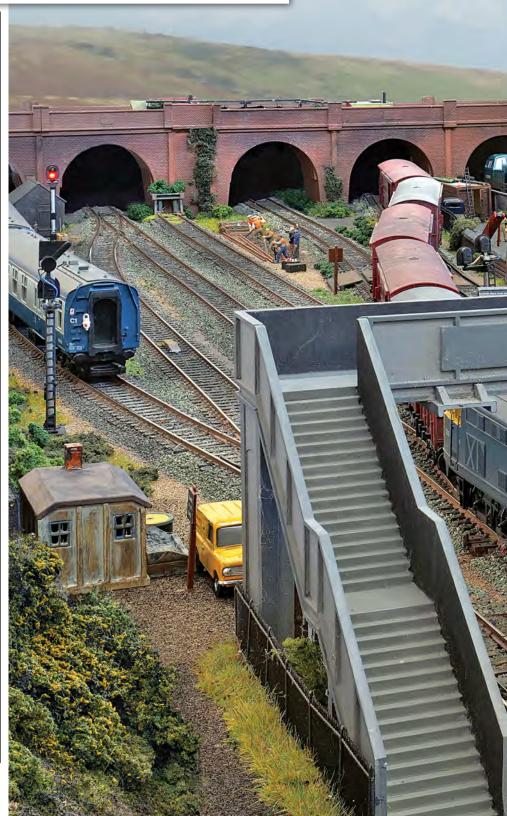
The construction of this layout has given me huge enjoyment, and as a member of the Double O Gauge Association I'm grateful for their technical and sociable support and to go just that stage further in railway modelling.

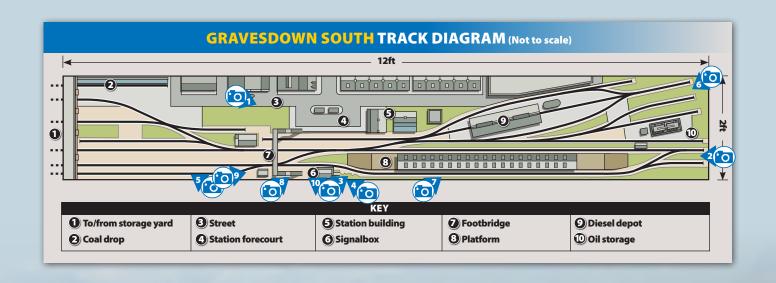
Colour light signals, yard and street lamps have now been added, and it seems to be every month a new product is on the market to upgrade and add, and this continues. I've been vague about the actual location and while the main era is 1970s to '80s BR blue I also own rolling stock ranging from the mid-1960s through to the late 1980s with a West Country bias, so any situation and era could be accommodated, even with the appropriate road vehicles. Rolling stock continues to be further detailed and weathered as required.

I thank Trevor Jones for his excellent photography and since those initial dreams and ideas nearly 50 years ago, I'm now pleased I have a layout that is as complete as it is.

Heljan has been making the most of its back catalogue during 2020 with re-releases of its 'Hymek' and 'Deltic' which have now been followed by the original split headcode Class 37s. **MIKE WILD** inspects one of the five new versions arriving this summer.

REVIEWS FEATURE

In 2019 Heljan announced it would be producing a new batch and this time the model would feature a number of upgrades to bring its mechanics and electrics into line with the latest 'O' gauge diesels in its range.

Namely LED directional lighting, a DCC friendly Printed Circuit Board (PCB) and associated wiring plus revised underframe tanks taking their design from the centre headcode version.

THE MODEL

Five versions are being released, and even as *Hornby Magazine* went to press at the end of July one had already sold out to retailers from the new production run. Liveries available cover BR green with small yellow warning panels (Cat No. 3700), BR blue with full



yellow ends (3701), plain BR green (3702), 37116 *Comet* in BR'large logo' blue (3703) and BR green with full yellow ends (3704).

Our review sample is 37116 which Heljan has issued with

full weathering from the factory together with its unique livery elements such as unofficial Tinsley Depot applied *Comet* nameplates and Railfreight logos under the secondman's window on each cab.

This is the first time that the split headcode Class 37 has been offered in 'large logo' blue livery – only a handful carried this colour scheme – and it looks superb, especially with the weathered finish. In



combination the livery decoration really makes this locomotive stand out and, not surprisingly, this is the version which is fully subscribed by Heljan retailers.

The body is identical to the first batch produced in 2008 and each model features pre-fitted headcodes or 'dominos' behind the headcode glazing. Separately fitted handrails are applied throughout, including tiny grab handles on top of the headcodes, together with a full set of factory fitted bufferbeam pipes, working screw link couplings and sprung buffers on all four corners.

The chassis features modified narrower underframe tanks at its centre and there are also sandpipes either side too. The bogies are neatly done and capture the style of the real locomotive's underpinnings.

PERFORMANCE

In common with all of Heljan's big 'O' gauge diesels, the Class 37 has two five-pole motors – one on each bogie – which drive the outer axles via a gear train. Brass flywheels are mounted on top of each motor for smooth running and the twin motor set up provides ample haulage capacity to haul long heavy trains. A seven coach train of Heljan Mk 1s was no match for our sample which glided near silently around our test track throughout all our testing with analogue control.

The upgrade to LED lighting is a big step forward over the previous bulb lighting of the original batch while the DCC friendly PCB will make it simpler to install a decoder into these new versions as it has colour coded wiring. There is also

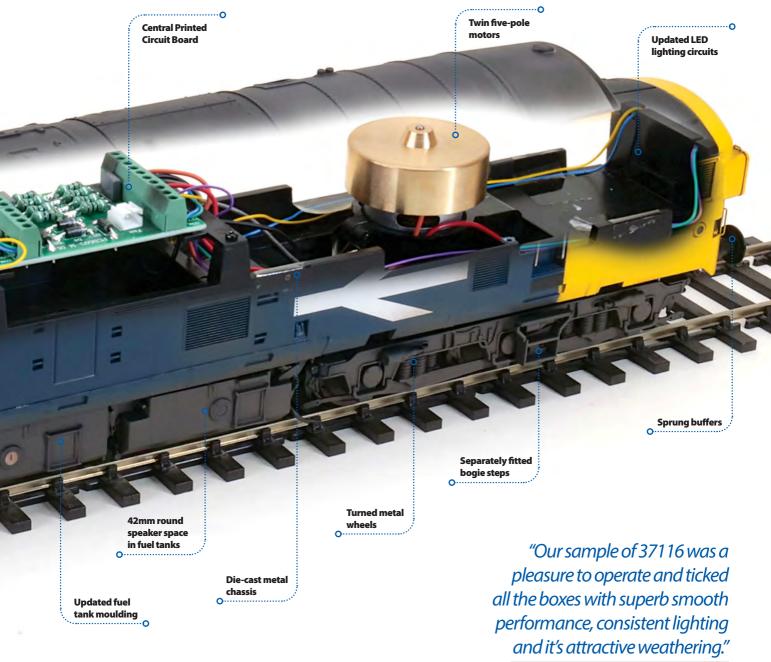
space for a speaker in the fuel tanks with the casting of the die-cast metal chassis being designed to accommodate a 42mm round type.

OVERALL

Until recently Heljan's 'O' gauge locomotives were generally expected to be single production runs, but it is encouraging to see older products which have been out of production brought back to life for a second outing. It shows the progress of the 'O' gauge market and the demand that there is for these impressive and weighty products.

Our sample of 37116 was a pleasure to view and operate and ticked all the boxes with superb smooth performance, consistent lighting and its attractive weathering. And, its hard to resist a Class 37, isn't it! (MW)

One of the most successful diesel locomotives ever to run in Britain is the English Electric Class 37, a design that has now given 60 years of front-line service to our railways.

EVAN GREEN-HUGHES

looks back at the inception and early years of this popular machine.

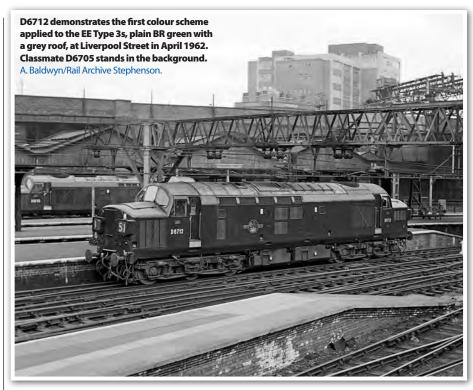


OOKING BACK AT THE
Modernisation Plan of 1955, it
is fair to say that a great number
of mistakes were made. In the
rush to eliminate steam a large
number of diesel locomotives,
many to completely untried designs, were
ordered and arbitrary decisions were taken
concerning technical standards, many of
which were later proved to be wanting.

One of the more puzzling of these was that no requirement was identified for a go-anywhere mixed traffic locomotive developing between 1,300hp and 1,900hp, a decision that left a large gap between the smaller and lighter Bo-Bos and the big and heavy Type 4s such as the Sulzer 'Peaks' and English Electric Type 4s.

By the time this gap had been identified, and the decision taken to proceed with the provision of locomotives in this power category, British Railways' workshops were already working flat out producing other types of diesels, while many of the private contractors also had full order books. One of the few that was not working to capacity was English Electric, a company





with considerable experience in the provision of diesel traction and which had already constructed a locomotive to a similar brief for an overseas contract.

It is not clear exactly how English Electric came to be selected as the preferred builder for the new Type 3. It may just be that no one else had the workshop capacity at that time, but it could also be that the company was in a good position to be able to offer a competitive price because it proposed to cut costs by basing its design on elements of its export locomotive and its existing Type 4, later the Class 40. In doing so it could use many existing components, including the nose ends, cab doors, windows and other fittings, in turn producing locomotives at a little over £89,000 a unit.

English Electric received an order for 42 examples straight off the drawing board, with the first 30 of these intended for the Great Eastern section and the remainder for the North Eastern Region, to be based at Blaydon. In appearance they were much like the Type 4 but would be mounted on a pair of three-axle bogies and would be shorter. The internal layout of the engine and the mechanicals followed the earlier pattern of the Type 4, with a 12-cylinder engine being used which developed 1,750hp, but in this case all axles were powered as the small carrying wheels used on the larger 1-Co-Co-1 were not required. Four-character headcode boxes were specified, as were end connecting doors, and this resulted in a rather ungainly arrangement where two characters were placed each side of the connecting door. In accordance with the mixed traffic role anticipated, most locomotives also had a steam heating boiler fitted.

Construction took place at the famous Vulcan Foundry at Newton-le-Willows and such was the confidence that the design would be a success that a second order was placed for 37 more with another 40 ordered shortly afterwards. Eventually there were to be 309 of these versatile locomotives with construction being shared between the Vulcan Foundry and English Electric's other plant, Robert Stephenson and Hawthorns Ltd of Darlington.

MAIDS OF ALL WORK

The first batch of engines, D6700-D6729, was allocated to the Great Eastern section of the Eastern Region with the bulk being based at Stratford, though Norwich, March and Ipswich also had examples. On this region they were considered to be mixed traffic engines and could be found on any kind of duty. This included express passenger turns as the class would be used to fill in on the Liverpool Street-Norwich expresses when a Type 4 was not available, and also on services to Cambridge.

The class also found favour on the Harwich boat trains which they worked as far as Sheffield Victoria and which had formerly been worked by 'Britannia' class 'Pacifics'. Later these trains were worked right through to Liverpool after the decision was taken not to replace the Type 3s with electric traction at Sheffield - for a while they were the only diesels to be used over the Woodhead route during daylight hours. Many of the 30-strong allocation were used on more mundane goods duties, including inter-regional transfer trains, while trials were also carried out to compare the two English Electric types on coal trains on the Cambridge lines.

In common with many other diesels of the period, the early English Electric Type 3s were delivered in a plain green livery, with grey roof and red bufferbeam. This first batch does not appear to have had any form of front-end warning panel when delivered, but very soon had a half-height yellow panel added in common with other diesel classes of the period.

The GE batch of locomotives was delivered >>>

REALITY CHECK

between December 1960 and the following October and production then moved on to the order for the 12 engines for the North Eastern Region. By this time there had been a change of plan and Blaydon was no longer being considered as a suitable site for diesel maintenance, so the new locomotives were reallocated to Hull, where a new diesel depot was being provided. D6730-D6741 duly appeared between October 1961 and June the following year. The North Eastern Region again made full use of the type's mixed traffic abilities and examples were recorded working express fish trains to Manchester as well as general long-distance freights. The class was also preferred traction for excursions and were used on football specials as far afield as Wembley and for holiday trains to destinations such as Butlin's at Filey, many times taking over their trains from express locomotives at places such as Doncaster.

Due to pressures of work at the Vulcan Foundry ten of the next batch of 37 engines were built at sister plant Robert Stephenson and Hawthorns in Darlington. D6742-D6754 were allocated to Darnall in Sheffield, while D6755-D6778 went to Thornaby. All were identical to the earlier batch. The Darnall examples then proceeded to put in some good work on Sheffield Victoria to King's Cross expresses, and worked services into East Anglia, while also being used for express goods work. The Thornaby examples were more commonly found on freight work, so much so that within six years of being built many examples were reported as having their steam heating boilers removed. Much of the work in the North East was on more mundane services, rather than on prestige express goods services.

LAST OF THE LINE

The final 40 Type 3s to be built to the original 'split headcode' design were ordered between April and December of 1961, with construction of D6779-D6795 taking place at Robert Stephenson and Hawthorns and D6796-D6818 being constructed at the Vulcan Foundry. The RSH engines went to Hull Dairycoates and Gateshead while the Vulcan Foundry-

built examples were allocated to Darnall in Sheffield. After this engines received a revised nose end. This came about because a debate had been raging within BR about the appearance of the locomotives, with some proposing a radical redesign to place the cab forward and eliminate the noses while others proposed a mere tidying up of the front, which is what eventually happened.

The Hull-based examples found some work on expresses originating at King's Cross, taking over their trains at Doncaster, as well as general freight but soon found themselves transferred north to Thornaby where they joined classmates on general freight work. The Gateshead examples were used to dieselise the route between Newcastle and Carlisle working both passenger and freight trains, although much of the passenger work had by this time passed over to DMUs. In the North East, these locomotives were entrusted with some of the heaviest general freight trains and many could be found

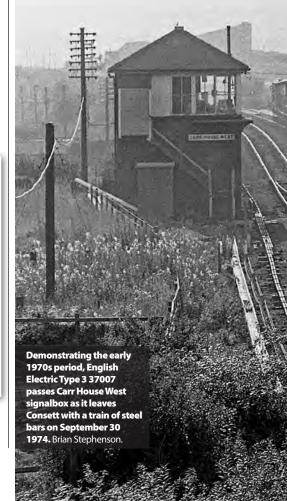
working with brake tenders due to their relatively light weight and the lack of continuously braked goods stock.

STRONG PERFORMERS

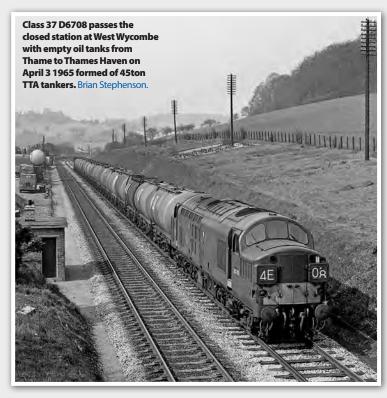
Largely speaking the English Electric Type 3s worked reliably straight from the factory, with the only issue of note in the early years being problems with bogic fractures, which were soon sorted by revising the bogic design. In their early years they

seemed equally at home on prestige express workings as well as more mundane pick-up freights, but as time went on they tended to be allocated more and more to goods work, with passenger duties limited to secondary routes such as those in west Wales and in Scotland. Even today examples of this oncenumerous class can still be found at work on the system, and while their identities have been hidden by modifications and renumberings, quite a few of those which

still exist are from these early batches. Prototype D6700 is now part of the National Collection and can be usually found on display at York, while a few are at work with Colas Rail and Direct Rail Services. Some have inevitably reached preservation, with examples restored to their original appearance in green while others have been restored in blue and one even wears the now-obsolete triple-grey Railfreight colours.

The English Electric Type 3, or Class

37, was one of the Modernisation Plan's outstanding successes, which is a most remarkable feat considering that it was a type of locomotive that was thought to not be required, was designed in a relative hurry and never had the benefit of a pilot batch or any formal testing. That it has now lasted in service for over six decades speaks volumes for the work of English Electric, and the soundness of its overall design concepts.

timetabled HST passenger service from London Paddington on May 18 2019 and the 'Flying Banana' farewell railtour a few weeks later. 43198 had just recently received its dual identity, while W43002 was named after the HST designer at a ceremony at St Phillip's

Marsh HST depot in 2016. For this release, Hornby has given both power cars a gloss paint finish which really boosts their appeal for those who wish to have a commemorative memento of GWR's farewell to the HST on traditional long-distance services. W43002 is now part of the National Collection, while 43198 remains in the GWR fleet - a small number of HST power cars have been retained for use on some South West services with shortened formations of Mk 3 carriages with new sliding doors.

Bearing the hallmarks of previous releases, the motorised vehicle features a heavy chassis and five-pole skew-wound motor, while both vehicles also feature directional lighting, opening cab doors, detailed interior, separately applied handrails, brake disc detail and much more. Each has an 8-pin decoder socket.

However, it is the decoration where this model excels, with Hornby delivering a showroom shine thanks to a first-rate gloss finish to both power cars, although it is probably a tad glossier than the real things appeared in service at the time. That said, application of both liveries is superb - the InterCity 125 liveried example

Modellers of current intermodal traffic receive a boost with the release of this pair of 'OO' gauge KFA container flats from Hornby.

As with previous releases, these latest KFA vehicles feature an exquisitely detailed die-cast metal chassis, sprung metal buffers, separately fitted handbrake wheels, buffer rungs and neatly moulded bogies with yellow SKF axle boxes. One KFA, numbered TIPH93367, contains a pair of Ocean Network Express (ONE) liveried containers – a 40ft example in ONE magenta



with white lettering and a 20ft box in reversed ONE white with magenta lettering – while the other KFA, TIPH93437, features three ISO tanks in Contank yellow, RMI Logistics grey and Tate and Lyle white. Each container/ tank sits securely on the deck of the KFA, while the containers also feature opening doors and separately applied door bars.

Application of the blue Touax branded livery and various container colour schemes is superb throughout, with branding, numbers, data panels, labelling and lettering all crisply applied. The liveries depicted on the tanks are representative of the real thing, while the distinctive ONE liveried box containers reflect the vivid scheme now prevalent on the full-size railway. A separate pack containing air pipes and replacement ROCO style couplings is also included. (MC)

OLLOWING the sell-out success of its centenary limited edition earlier this year (HM154), Hornby's standard catalogue release of its 'OO' gauge model of Stephenson's Rocket 0-2-2 touched down during July.

As with the Hornby 100 edition, this release is also presented in similar book-style packaging, although on this occasion it features a silhouette of Rocket on the cover with National Railway Museum branding on the spine. On opening

the packaging, the locomotive and three First Class carriages are housed in protective rubberised foam.

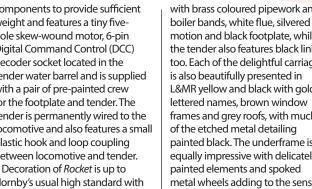
Whilst Rocket appears the same as the previous release, the first class coaches on this occasion carry the names Globe, Renown and Wellington over the Liverpool and Manchester Railway (L&MR) yellow and black colour scheme. Each is neatly moulded with fine etched metal detailing such as railings, footsteps, step boards and more. Rocket also employs a mix of moulded and metal

components to provide sufficient weight and features a tiny fivepole skew-wound motor, 6-pin Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder socket located in the tender water barrel and is supplied with a pair of pre-painted crew for the footplate and tender. The tender is permanently wired to the locomotive and also features a small plastic hook and loop coupling between locomotive and tender.

Hornby's usual high standard with an evenly applied yellow paint finish

with brass coloured pipework and boiler bands, white flue, silvered motion and black footplate, while the tender also features black lining too. Each of the delightful carriages is also beautifully presented in L&MR yellow and black with gold lettered names, brown window frames and grey roofs, with much of the etched metal detailing painted black. The underframe is equally impressive with delicately painted elements and spoked metal wheels adding to the sense that this train pack is something

special. Plastic moulded chain couplings are supplied separately for connecting to the coupling hooks on each vehicle, resulting in a three-coach train which measures approximately 320mm in total. With Hornby recently announcing plans to produce a complementary open third vehicle (see Update page 8-9), this Rocket pack is also sure to fly! (MC)

Hornby's long-lived 25ton Bogie Bolster A makes a welcome return as 'Macaw' 107402 in BR grey. It has also been released in GWR grey.

Whilst this is one of Hornby's older models, it still passes muster with moulded decking, bolsters, underframe detail and separately supplied stanchions for customer fitment.

Application of the BR grey paint scheme is smart, as is the

wooden-coloured decking, while white numbers and lettering on black backgrounds are sharp throughout. Underneath, the black underframe incorporates a metal sub-frame for extra weight along with three-hole turned metal wheels in the bogies. Despite the larger style of tension lock coupling, which can be removed, Hornby's Bogie Bolster A remains an important wagon type and still looks the part. (MC)

Hornby's 'OO' gauge London Midland & Scottish Railway (LMS) Covered Carriage Truck (CCT) gains a new identity for its latest release as British Rail Research and Development Division's RDB975667 in Railway Technical Centre (RTC) red and blue.

Hornby's colourful new release replicates the prototype in the scheme carried into the early 1980s, displaying its departmental number and Track Research Laboratory branding, with accurate spacing of lettering across the bodyside bracing. Further RTC liveried vehicles are also planned for release shortly using Hornby's Mk 1 fleet.

Decoration is neatly applied with crisp white lining between the main red and blue livery elements, along with grey roof, black underframe and yellow ends. Overhead live wire flashes feature at each end, although the scientific instrument/warning lettering, displayed on the yellow ends of the prototype in reference images, appears to be missing – a minor issue which can be remedied with Railtec Transfers pack 2757.

Rectangular metal buffers, two-hole disc metal wheels and small tension lock couplings in NEM pockets complete what is sure to prove a popular model in this attractive livery. (MC)

For review we received a pair of 1,200mm x 600mm (4ft x 2ft) ready-made plywood boards together with a full set of back scenes for the rear and ends, WRM's plug and latch joining system and a plywood laser

cutcontrol shelf plus plywood laser cut legs. All joining bolts were included with the set together with hex key tools to secure the bolts in place.

In combination this makes up an 8ft x 2ft space on which a model railway can be built and, through the positioning of additional holes, further boards can be purchased later to expand the size of the design. Also worth knowing is that seven lengths and six widths are available, so the range of laser cut plywood boards is comprehensive too.

Our sample boards were superbly built and sturdy. Each is made with 9mm plywood for the

top and sides while the internal frame is cut from 6mm plywood. Neatly the inner structure has removable circles to allow wiring to pass through the baseboard frame as required. The upper surface is overlaid with a sheet of Cork and Neoprene as sound deadening and the finishing touch.

Assembly of our sample boards took less than 30 minutes with the alignment of the two halves being as simple as it could be – add alignment dowels, push boards together and latch in place with the catch and latch system. Completing the assembly was the addition of MDF back scene panels, all pre-cut to shape to fit

around the latches, and bolting the control shelf in place.

These are very high-quality boards which have been designed with modellers in mind. The simplicity of their assembly is first-rate and we were impressed by the seamless joint between the two baseboards once they were latched together. The control shelf is useful too and a neat addition while WRM also offers Controller Holders to house DCC handsets which can be mounted on the edge of the board.

If quality and simplicity are what you are looking for, White Rose Modelworks is the place to go right now. (MW)

New from Peco are these delightful 'OO9' four-wheel Ffestiniog Railway Bug Box coaches.

Built in the 1860s for the Ffestiniog Railway (FR) by Brown, Marshall and Company of Birmingham, these four-wheel passenger coaches are amongst the oldest railway vehicles still in regular use in the world. They gained the nickname 'Bug Boxes' during the 1950s.

For review, our 1960s period review samples included a First Class carriage (Cat No. GR-551), Third Class coach (GR-556) and an Open Third vehicle – or Zoo car – with Observation Car lettering (GR-561). Each vehicle is neatly glazed and detail differences are clear – the First Class car features five main windows, while the Third Class coach has three main

windows and four smaller panels each side. Peco's tooling suite will cater for further variations.

As with the prototypes, the interiors are basic with moulded brown longitudinal bench seating, accessed through a single central door on each side. The roof is a clip fit, enabling quick and easy access should you wish to populate them with passengers.

Decoration is smart, with our review samples being finished in early preservation green and cream with red oxide ends and grey roof. Door handles are picked out in brass, while company crests feature on each door too.

As the vehicles are low-slung, they appear to glide along the track and whilst quite light, our plastic wheeled samples ran



smoothly on test. Factory-applied brake pipes are fitted to each end, while removable narrowgauge peg and loop couplings feature in coupler pockets, too. Impressive new additions to Peco's Great Little Trains range of 'OO9' rolling stock. (MC)

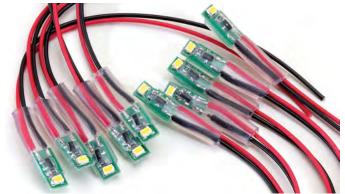

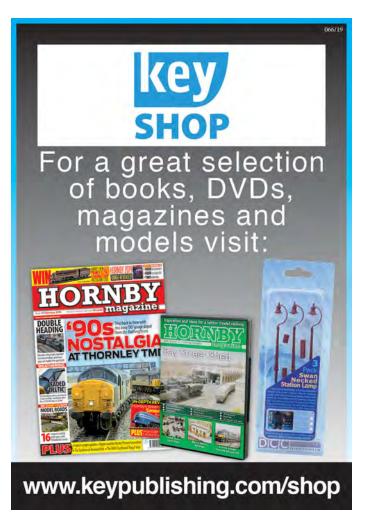

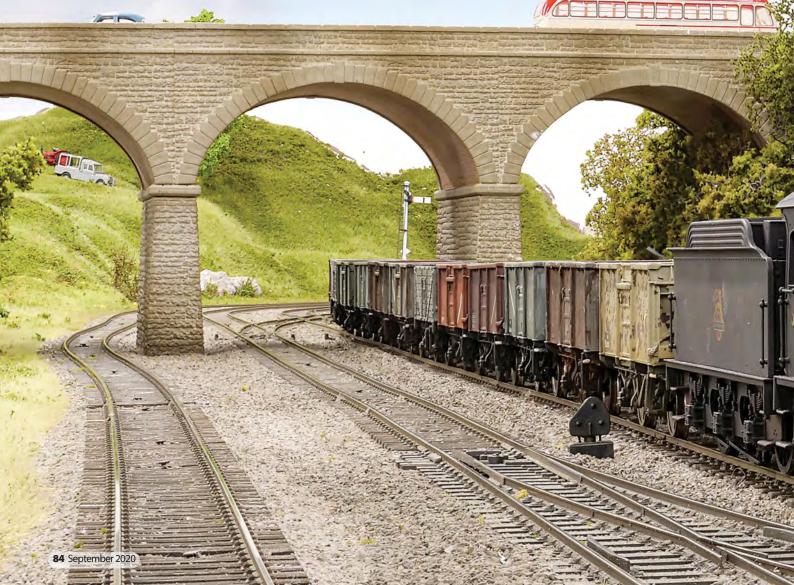

Eight-coupled freight engines were hard working locomotives and Locoman Sounds has set out to recreate that effect with its Doehler & Haass sound file for the Raven 'Q6' 0-8-0. **MIKE WILD** shows how it can be installed in the Hornby model with extra features.

HE Raven 'Q6' 0-8-0 was a great choice for Hornby's 2016 product range. We had been missing genuine, home-grown North Eastern Railway (NER) motive power from the ready-to-run roster and it has been a popular addition for 'OO' gauge.

The real locomotives were introduced in 1913 by Vincent Raven and classified 'T2' under the NER's motive power system. They were built for heavy freight haulage on the NER network which included heavy steel and iron ore trains as well as typical mineral workings of the North East. They were solid, reliable and simple locomotives which maximised weight over the eight-coupled driving wheels for adhesion to make them capable of moving heavy loads on the steeply graded routes on their home region.



DIGITAL CONTROL

Their outside cylinders gave them a distinct appearance and they later went on to serve the London North Eastern Railway (LNER) when they were reclassified 'Q6' (Q being the LNER designation for an 0-8-0) – and British Railways (BR) before withdrawal between 1963 and 1967. Considering their vintage, these rugged 0-8-0s did well to continue in service until the very end of steam in the North East.

In preservation just one example survives at the North Yorkshire Moors Railway, 63395 – it is owned and operated by the North Eastern Locomotive Preservation Group and it has been in service regularly over the years.

Locoman Sounds' D&H audio chip was created by recording the sole-surviving 'Q6' at the NYMR. Its comprehensive sound project

includes boiler and exhaust sounds, whistles, brakes, ancillary functions, coasting, door closing sounds and more. It also provides the option to add directional lights and firebox flicker which we made use of in this project. The working lamps we used are DCC Concepts LNER pattern type which are straightforward to install. The only complication here is routing the wires back through the locomotive to the tender.

Firebox flicker adds a neat touch to the cab of a locomotive and a sense of life. The firebox flicker can be actioned in two ways, and in both cases operates simultaneously with the coal shovelling sounds. Option one is to use the Aux 1 connection from the decoder which requires a flickering LED to work correctly. Option two uses a standard LED but requires soldering direct to the

decoder circuit board in order to use Aux 3 to switch the LED on and off. We opted for the latter in this case.

Adding extra functions is an ideal way to take a step towards greater realism and the extra work involved in adding these new functions to the locomotive is well worth while. Furthermore, Locoman's 'Q6' sound file is superb. Its producer has a great ear for steam locomotive sounds and through the D&H decoder gains a highly realistic tone to the exhaust beat in the finished project which you can hear in our video on keymodelworld.com

The following step by step guide shows how we installed a D&H 8-pin decoder, a 40mm x 20mm twin speaker plus lamps and firebox flicker into the Hornby model.

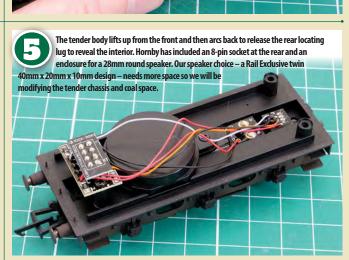


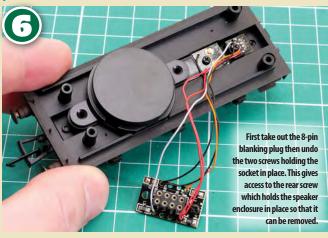

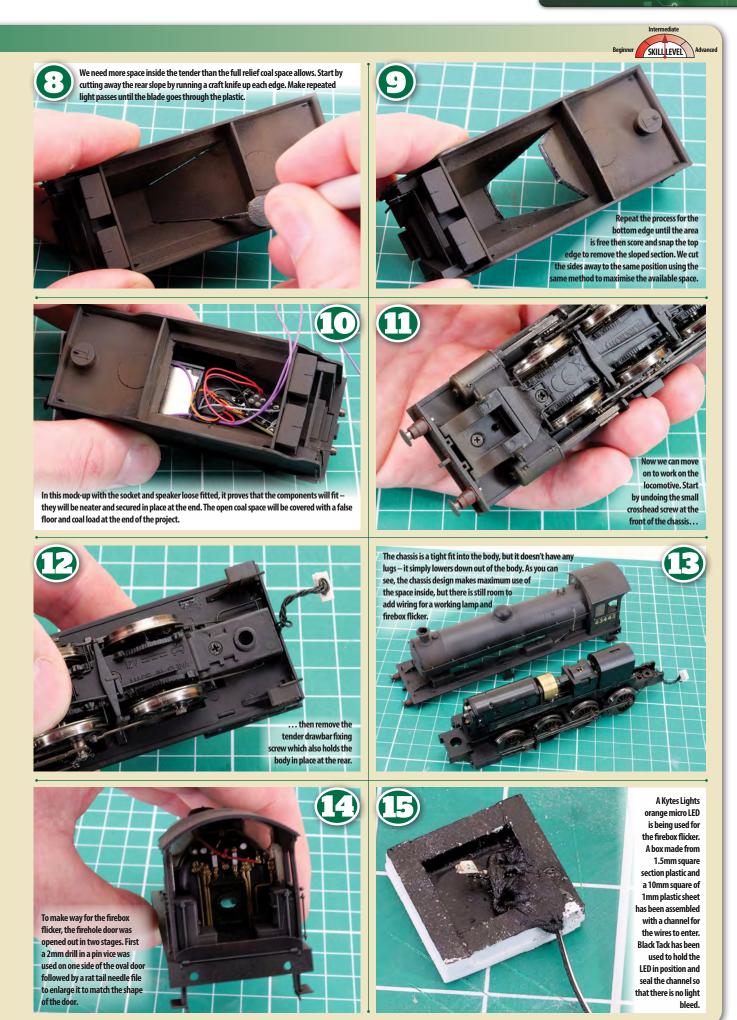






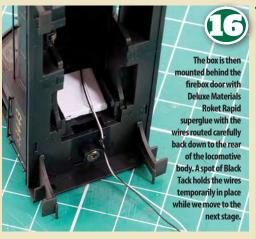
The final modification required to the tender chassis is removal of the supports for the decoder socket. These are plastic and a single pass with a craft knife removed them. Be careful of delicate items like the lamp brackets when doing this.

To provide the negative connection to the firebox flicker LED we are using the Aux 3 output from the decoder as this means that a standard orange LED can be used. To do this the white wire from the micro LED (its negative lead) needs to be connected to the Aux 3 solder pad on the decoder.

Twelve Trees Junction: 11:15 1RAINS

Hornby Magazine's busy Southern Region junction layout hasn't been out on show for almost two years, but there have been plenty of new additions to its roster.

MIKE WILD takes a closer look at the locomotives and rolling stock which allow Twelve Trees Junction to reflect the final decade of steam on the Southern.

WELVE TREES JUNCTION is one of our biggest exhibition layouts and also our longest serving. At 24ft x 10ft, it is a substantial model and it needs a large collection of locomotives and rolling stock to make it function properly during an exhibition weekend.

In lieu of the layout's planned appearance at the 2020 Great Electric Train Show in October, we decided to bring Twelve Trees out for a brand new feature to showcase the changes which have taken place with its roster since we last featured it in Hornby Magazine almost 60 issues ago.

Over the past two decades, interest in the Southern Region has reached an all-time high, and that is definitely assisted by the huge range of motive power now available off the shelf. No other region offers the same spread of steam, diesel and electric traction running side by side, which is one of the great appeals of the Southern.

Hornby has been prolific in creating outstanding ready-to-run Southern Railway/Region locomotives with recent highlights including its air-smoothed Bulleid 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s, Maunsell 'Lord Nelson' 4-6-0, Maunsell 'S15' 4-6-0 and even the humble Adams '0415' 4-4-2T. Better still, the rise isn't just related to steam locomotives as we have also seen Hornby produce the Class 71 electric, Dapol the Class 73 electro-diesel and a whole series of multiple units are now available from Bachmann and Hornby. More are on the way too with Bachmann's long-awaited 2-HAP unit currently expected in August. New carriages have also been delivered, making modelling of this part of the BR network even more achievable.

TWELVE TREES REFRESHER

First though, a little context about Twelve Trees. Construction started in late 2011, but it wasn't until 2013 that it really got underway with a brand new trackplan. Even then the layout was only a set of four 4ft x 3ft scenic baseboards without storage yards and it was another year before we completed the full scheme to allow it to make its debut at the Great Electric Train Show in October 2014. In that format the full size was 34ft x 8ft and to make it work we built three cassette storage yards to fund operation of

the main through lines and diverging route.

Twelve Trees stayed in its 34ft format until 2017 when we decided it was time we rebuilt the layout into a continuous run to make it more enjoyable to operate. During the summer we repurposed the original cassette yard boards as well as building new corner boards for the storage yard while also creating potential for two new scenic sections at the front. The first of those was completed in 2017 while the second is still on the job list for the future.

The biggest impact with the design change was that we could now showcase more rolling stock and operate the layout more fluently. With the old system there could be pauses in the service while we changed trains over, but with the new continuous run storage yard we were able to deliver a more consistent pace of trains passing through the scenic section as well as making the most of the complex junction trackplan. STEAM DELIGHTS

Steam is at the heart of the fleet for Twelve Trees and reflects the final decade of its service between 1957 and 1967. Covering this period allows the collection to be quite diverse, as we can include Drummond, Urie, Adams and Maunsell designs alongside the latest generation of steam locomotives from Bulleid and Riddles. Naturally there are exceptions to the rule, but that's all part of the enjoyment of running a model railway.

All of the steam locomotives which form part of the exhibition roster are sound fitted using a combination of ZIMO, ESU and now Doehler & Haass chips to bring them to life. Each of these uses a suitable speaker while three of the air-smoothed 'West Country' 4-6-2s and the 'Golden Arrow' decorated 'Britannia' 4-6-2 are also equipped with smoke generators. Expansion of the sound fleet continues too with future projects including a rebuilt 'Battle of Britain' to run alongside the rebuilt 'West Country' plus sound for the new Hornby 'Lord Nelson' 4-6-0.

Amongst the latest additions to the fleet are Hornby's air-smoothed 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s modelling 35023 *Holland Afrika Line* and 35028 *Clan Line* in BR lined green. Both are fitted with ZIMO sound decoders while 35028 features firebox glow and working electric cab lights. There is also a Hornby 'S15' on the roster finished as 30843 and suitably weathered to make it the perfect addition to the head of long goods trains.

Not quite so new, but still fresh for this update, is a Drummond '700' 0-6-0 which has been detailed with a coal load, crew, ZIMO sound decoder and weathering. This is a perfect engine for the ballast train or the newly added Bachmann steam crane in Southern Region black.

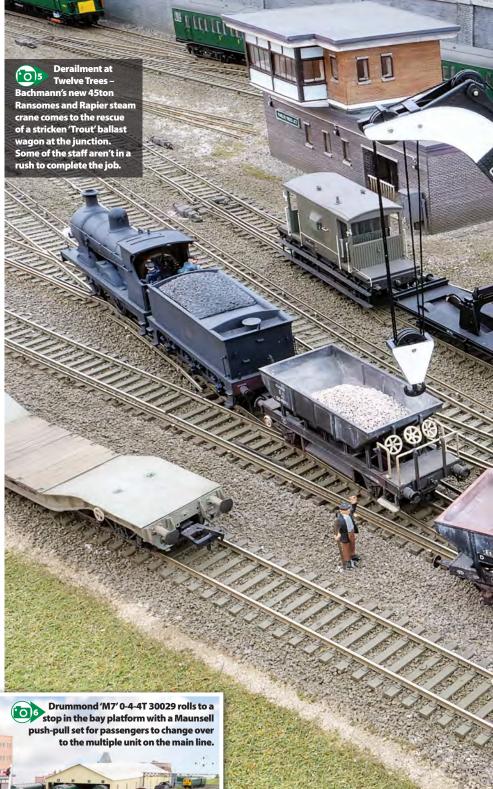
The most recent sound installation is Bulleid 'Q1' 0-6-0 33023 which has Locoman Sounds' new Southern Region two-cylinder sound file for the Doehler & Haass 8-pin decoder, as featured in HM148.

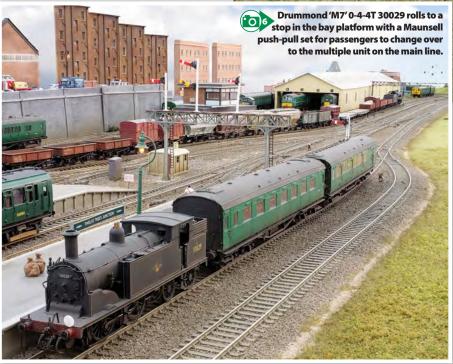
The steam roster isn't limited to big engines either. We have a range of tank engines available including a trio of 0-4-4Ts which are used on the push-pull trains from the bay platform. These are Drummond 'M7' 0-4-4T 30029 fitted with an ESU decoder and a Howes sound file together with Wainwright 'H' 0-4-4T 31518 and Adams 'O2' 0-4-4T 30182 which have ZIMO MX648 decoders and Digitrains sound files. Technically it would have been rare to see the 'H' from the South Eastern section alongside the 'M7' and 'O2', but the joy of modelling means it can happen. We also regularly use a Bachmann Billinton 'E4' 0-6-2T – again fitted with a ZIMO sound chip - which works alongside the likes of a BR '3MT' 2-6-2T and '4MT' 2-6-4T on lighter passenger formations as well as empty stock movements.

The late steam era collection features more BR Standards with the '3MT' and '4MT' tanks being joined by a pair of '4MT' 2-6-0s, occasionally a '4MT' 4-6-0 and '5MT' 4-6-0 73082 *Camelot*. There are also two rebuilt 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s – 35017 *Belgian Marine* with a Locoman Sounds decoder and 35025 *Brocklebank Line* with a South West Digital ESU chip.

ELECTRIC OVERLOAD

A key feature of Twelve Trees' roster is the large collection of electric locomotives and multiple units that Mark and I have amassed over the years. One of the most popular additions has been the Class 71 electrics of which, between us, we now have six available for the layout with a combination of the currently available Hornby model and the out of production DJ Models product in service. These include E5015 with full 'Golden Arrow' regalia, a heavily weathered E5022 which is usually at the head of a block train of Ferry Vans and E5001 in BR green with small yellow warning panels. None of these locomotives are sound fitted. The Class 71s are joined by an expanding





fleet of Dapol Class 73s. Last time we showed Twelve Trees Junction in *Hornby Magazine* this highly detailed 'OO' gauge model hadn't been released, but since its arrival we've added three to the roster – E6001 in BR green with small yellow warning panels, E6003 in BR green with a grey solebar plus E6022 in BR blue with small yellow warning panels. Undoubtedly more will join the fleet in the future.

Alongside the electrics we have a handful of diesels including a pair of Class 33/0s with ZIMO decoders which are normally at the head of Heljan Class B tankers, complete with barrier wagons, or a block train of Presflo cement wagons. Accurascale's Cemflo wagons will also join the fleet for exhibitions, but they are currently awaiting weathering. A third

Class 33 is available modelling D6580 in BR green – the first Class 33/1 to be modified with push-pull equipment to run with 4-TC units. It always operates in tandem with a Kernow Model Rail Centre 4-TC unit and the pairing has Legomanbiffo sound decoders installed which work together.

The most significant parts of the electric fleet are the multiple units. No model of the Southern Region third-rail network would be complete without them and it is quite staggering to realise how much is now available off the shelf. The fleet consists of four Bachmann 4-CEPs, four Bachmann 2-EPBs, multiples of the Hornby 2-BIL and 2-HAL units (more than we care to admit!) plus three 4-VEPs, a 4-TC and two 'Brighton Belle' units in ready-to-run form.

There are modified and kit built units too

including a BR 4-EPB - built by reworking a pair of Bachmann 2-EPBs — and an Ayjay Models 4-SUB unit which we recently renovated and equipped with decoders, extra pick-ups and stay alive capacitors for improved running. For this photo shoot we were also able to add an Ayjay Models Bulleid 'Tin'-HAL two-car set which has been a long term workbench project.

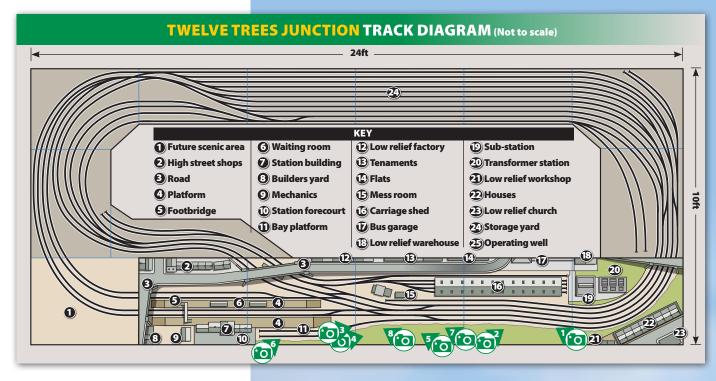
Not quite electric, but still in the same category, we also have a trio of Class 205 2-H Diesel Electric Multiple Units (DEMUs) available for the layout modelling the class in plain green, green with an orange triangle on the guard's end cab front and green with small yellow warning panels. On the workbench there is an old DC Kits 4-EPB unit awaiting an overhaul and new detailing parts to be fitted.

PASSENGER STOCK

When we first built Twelve Trees, the range of passenger stock available was restricted to four main types. We had Bachmann's Mk 1s and Bulleid 63ft main line corridor stock together with Hornby's eight-wheel Pullmans and its superb collection of Maunsell 59ft stock, but we've since been able to expand the line-up to include a full rake of Hornby 12-wheel Pullmans to model the 'Bournemouth Belle' as well as a new short three-car rake of BR Mk 1s from Hornby's new range.

More recently we've increased the carriage fleet significantly with the addition of Bachmann 'Birdcage' carriages, Hornby's rebuilt LSWR 58ft non-corridor carriages, the Maunsell Second Open and Restaurant car, LSWR 'Gate stock' push-pull carriages >>>

from Kernow Model Rail Centre and, earlier this year, Hornby's new set of Bulleid 59ft suburban corridor stock.

Altogether these new additions paint an ever more comprehensive picture of the carriage fleet on the Southern during the period we model on Twelve Trees and we are now eagerly looking forward to the arrival of Bachmann's brand-new models of the Bulleid 63ft stock.

THE FUTURE

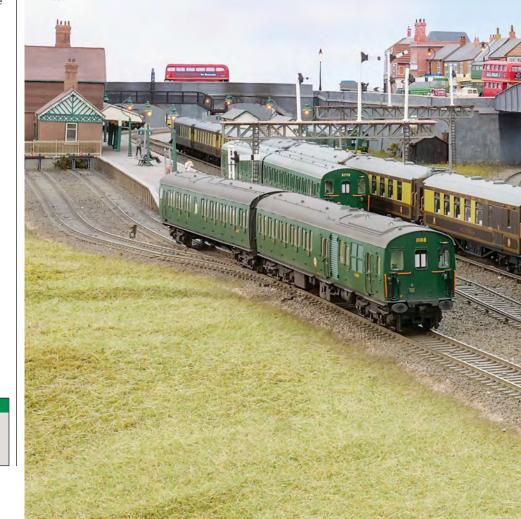
Twelve Trees Junction still has an extensive job list for the future both for its rolling stock and the layout. There are still locomotives, units, carriages and wagons to enter service following weathering and sound installation while undoubtedly there will be new additions to make our Southern scene even more realistic.

Away from the railway, the next big jobs are completing the sixth scenic board beyond the station and we have now set ourselves the target of having that ready for the new Great Electric Train Show event in Manchester in March 2021. Signalling is another important element for improvement – the existing signals are still the original 'stop gaps' that we built for it in 2013 – and the full plan is to follow Simon Paley's design from HM157.

Beyond that we've noticed the street scenes need more detail and fresh life breathing into them and many other small jobs around the railway which will make Twelve Trees a long-lasting part of the *Hornby Magazine* layout collection. We're already looking forward to putting this busy main line scene on show again in 2021 and beyond.

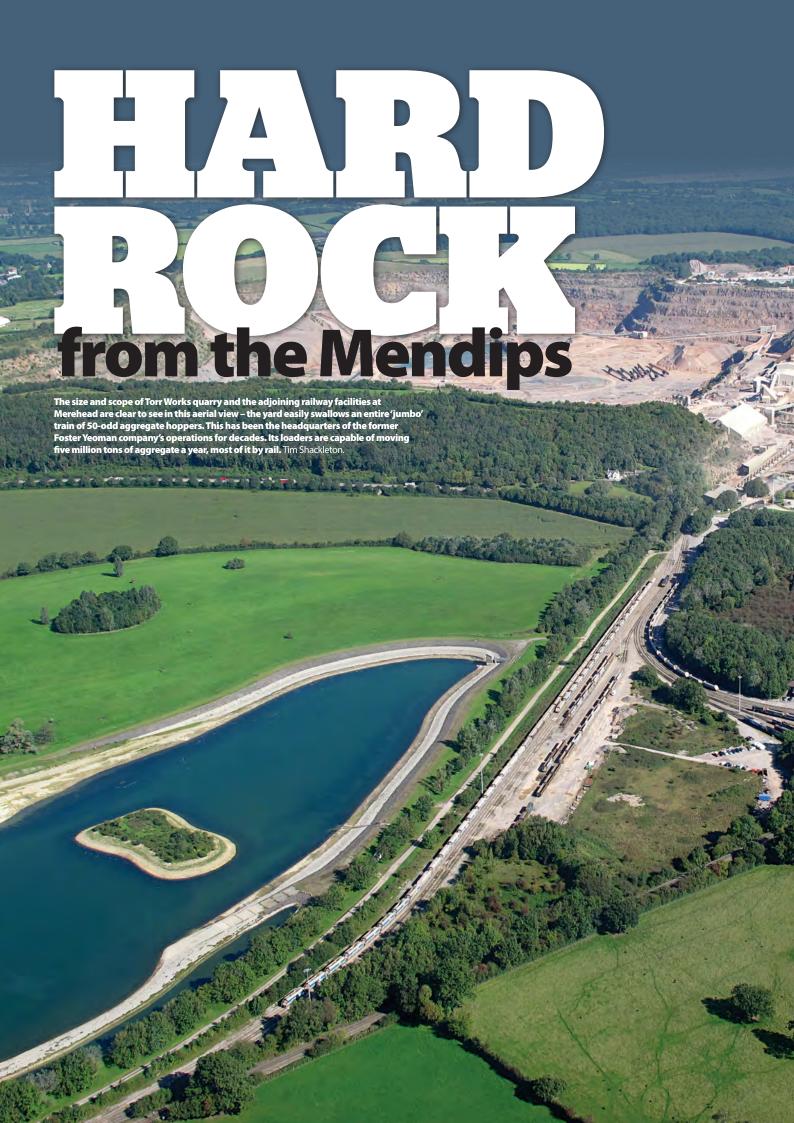

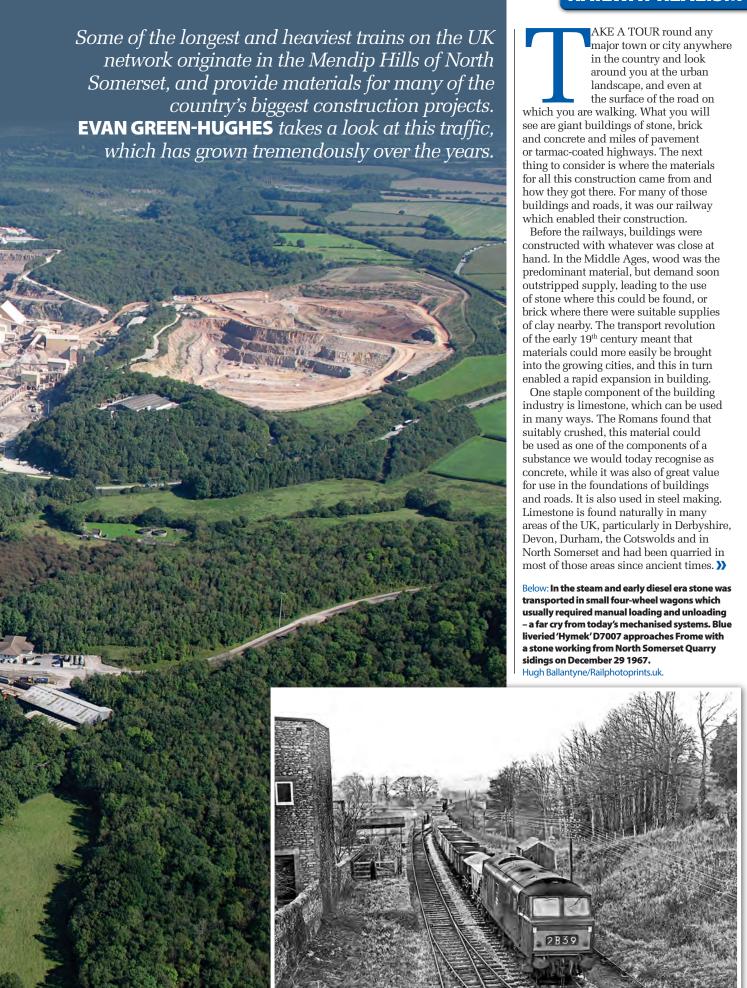

RAILWAY REALISM





ROMAN ORIGINS

In the Mendips, quarrying for limestone had been in progress since Roman times and prior to the industrial revolution stone from the area had been used to form the buildings in places such as Bath and Bristol. The industrial revolution led to an increase in production, particularly as the area was now served by the London and South Western and Great Western Railways. Much of this was still finished stone which could now be transported with ease to places such as London - an area which previously had been too remote to be economically supplied.

Surprisingly, it was the growth of the motor vehicle and the requirement for more and improved roads that was to provoke the biggest surge in production. By the end of the First World War, only about half a million tons was being quarried in the area each year. Within 15 years, production had risen threefold and was maintained at this level throughout the 1930s as the inter-war house-building boom continued to feed demand. An increase in the use of concrete and similar materials in the 1960s caused another doubling of demand but this was eclipsed as the 1970s arrived when the area was supplying around 13million tons a year to construction projects. There was a further boom in building in the 1980s and during this output peaked at almost

19million tons a year, a staggering 36-fold increase on the figures of 60 years before. Production has since fallen back to around two-thirds of that figure, but still represents about 10% of the country's output.

BULK AGGREGATES

During this period railways contributed to the rise in the use of aggregates. The Victorian railway used far less ballast than is common today, and many companies preferred to use cheaper ash instead. However, increased speed required deeper ballast beds while new routes such as High Speed One consumed massive quantities of aggregates, not only for ballast but also in the construction of the many structures on the line, which are now almost exclusively made of concrete.

Traditionally the products of the Mendips were transported in open four-wheel 10 or 12ton wagons which required manual loading and unloading at each end of the journey, but the Southern Railway in particular made several attempts at modernising the process with the introduction of conveyor or hopper loading.

Larger wagons appeared in British Railways days but these were still four-wheelers, although of all-steel construction and fitted with bottomdischarge equipment. For railway ballast the Southern introduced the bogie 'Walrus', which was fitted with discharge chutes at both sides and was so successful it was later adopted as a British Railways standard leading on to development of the 'Seacow' and 'Sealion' wagons.

Bogie box wagons were introduced in the early 1970s as a legacy of Dr Beeching's plan to streamline freight operations, in this case by running dedicated trains with high payload wagons, which were capable of higher speeds due to being fitted with continuous air brakes. Probably the most common of these was the PTA/JTA/JUA family which were built in three batches from 1972 and which were used on many of the heaviest trains then running, often powered by pairs of Class 37s, but later by dedicated freight locomotives such as the Class 56 and later Class 59s.

In theory the Mendips aggregate traffic should have been well served by the provision of rakes of these high-capacity wagons, with dedicated Class 56s hauling them, but in the early 1980s British Railways was becoming a constant source of irritation to its customers in the area, and in particular was a thorn in the side of quarry owner Foster Yeoman. From the late 1970s Bristol Bath Road depot had supplied six Class 56s which were supposed to work three trains daily, with two engines

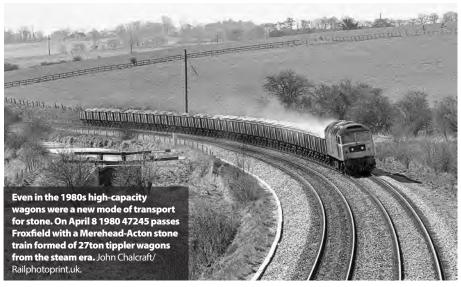


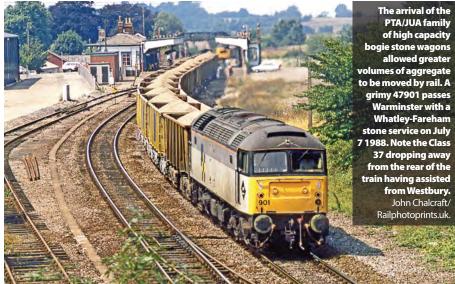
working in multiple. Unfortunately, such was the unreliability of British Rail equipment in those days that up to 40% of the trains ran late, with consequent knockon delays to construction projects, and the deep dissatisfaction of the customer.

AMERICAN INVASION

Foster Yeoman took the then revolutionary step of investigating the purchase of its own locomotives and rolling stock. The company saw the way forward as the provision of a small dedicated fleet of high-powered locomotives capable of working trains of 4,300 tons unaided. More importantly, guaranteed reliability of 96% was sought, something which was unheard of at the time in the UK, and a factor which caused British manufacturers to decline to tender for the project.

Instead Foster Yeoman turned to America and found that Electro-Motive Diesel was able to offer a scaled down version of its reliable and long-standing SD40 Co-Co diesel-electric locomotive to fit within the British loading gauge. Features included EMD's revolutionary super series creep control, with the resulting four locomotives arriving in 1986 together with a fifth which arrived in 1989. Longer trains began to be possible, timekeeping improved and more importantly the reliability target was met.





The success of this project did not escape Foster Yeoman's competitors as shortly afterwards Amey Roadstone (ARC) placed an order for four similar locomotives, which had only minor modifications to the lighting and the dampers so that they could run at a slightly higher speed. Later the two companies amalgamated their fleets so as to improve flexibility and to further cut costs, running them under the combined name of Mendip Rail.

The Class 59s lived up to their promise and actually achieved reliability of 99.8% in their first year of operation, causing more than a ripple in the British rail industry and indirectly leading to the adoption of the Class 66 from the same manufacturer as the 'standard' UK freight engine in the late 1990s.

The decision by Foster Yeoman did, in fact, have a substantial effect on British Rail's locomotive building programme, which ceased shortly afterwards with the construction of the contractor-built Class 60.

Today, and 34 years later, the Class 59s are still working just as hard as there is still a strong demand for aggregate from the Mendips to feed the construction frenzy in the South East, and in particular in London. In 2005 the Mendips fleet was expanded when the six former National Power Class 59s, which were ordered after the Foster

Yeoman and ARC examples but which had passed to freight operator EWS, began to be used alongside the original examples. All but one of the Class 59s are now operated by Freightliner, with 59003 forming part of the GB Railfreight fleet after its use in Germany between 1997 and 2014.

The faith which Foster Yeoman placed in American technology has been demonstrated by the reliability and haulage capacity of the Class 59. In May 1991 59005 set the European record for haulage when it hauled a train weighing 11,982 tons, a feat which has never even been approached by any previous design.

Today aggregate traffic forms a huge part of the UK's freight business and unlike many other forms of goods traffic is likely to continue to do so for the foreseeable future. Deposits in areas such as the Mendips are said to be good for up to 100 years, and are currently yielding 195million tons countrywide, most of which is distributed by rail, with around 157million tons per year being used in the construction industry. Limestone extraction in the Mendips has come a long way since single blocks of stone were taken out and dispatched in carts to build the notable buildings of Bath and it is rail that has played a major part in enabling that industry to expand to the successful level that it is at today.

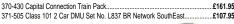

how he overcame a complex return loop situation while discovering even greater flexibility could be introduced with a new piece of trackwork and Digital Command Control electronics.

EVELOPING track plans that are interesting to operate is great fun, but every now and then I stumble across a design which creates a new electrical headache. The return loops of my garden railway are just one of those.

My initial criteria was simple - I wanted to create a double junction which continued the suggestion of a double track main line, even though the actual plan is a giant single track circuit. By keeping the double track theme around the return loop it would give me a second passing loop and all it needed was a pair of right-hand points and a diamond crossing. Peco offered all the track components I needed for 'O' gauge. The complication came in switching the crossing to compensate for the polarity reversing as trains travel round the loop.

To power the crossing I selected a Tam Valley Hex Frog Juicer, but I soon realised that there was more potential to be gained from the trackplan by replacing the diamond crossing with a double-slip. At the same time the track layout grew and developed to include a second

loop and a siding to store trains as well as a desire to reverse multiple units without having to negotiate the full return loop. Together with the plans for the internal storage yard, which use two loops and a series of dead end sidings, there was also a potential need to run trains back to the workshop 'wrong line' at the end of a running session.

All things considered I realised that I could swap the diamond crossing for a double slip using just one extra electrical component to create a multi-functional crossing which allowed much greater flexibility over train routing.

Introducing the double slip also created the need for a separate

polarity reversing module - a Dual Frog Juicer - for the loops and sidings to accommodate double headed or multi-decoder DMUs using this track section. The result is a clever piece of

trackwork which has been designed to keep its electrical secrets hidden out of view in sealed containers to protect them from the elements. In service it works perfectly and means that trains can sail through the pointwork onto either of the two loops creating the illusion of double track working as well as providing access to the sidings.

The Step by Step guide explains the full process involved in creating the polarity switching, polarity reversing set up for this layout and while it has been developed to work outdoors, the same principles can be used for an indoor layout, though there is no need to weatherproof the components as I have here if you building indoors.



This project covers the construction of the double junction on an 'O' ga den railway, but the methods are transferrable between scales. It prov ble track return loop at the end of the outdoor section. As the line is actually a continuous single circuit, the double slip, originally ed to be a diamond crossing, requ Frog Juicer to take care of reversing

STEP BY STEP

CREATING A SINGLE TRACK REVERSE LOOP WITH A HEX FROG JUICER

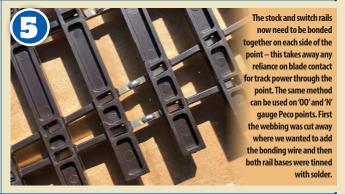


The track formation consists of two right-hand points and one double slip. The slip will mainly be used as a diamond crossing, but also provides bi-directional access to two sidings as well as the option to return trains 'wrong line' back to the internal storage lines in the workshop at the other end of the line. The baseboard is 18mm plywood which has been sealed and then covered with roofing felt for outdoor use.

The first stage is to mark and drill the holes for the point motors. The cover plate was turned to the side of each of the points and the outer positions of the tie-bar centre were marked with a 1mm drill bit. Next, the point was removed so that a 10mm hole could be drilled through the plywood base to accommodate the actuating rod of the point motor.









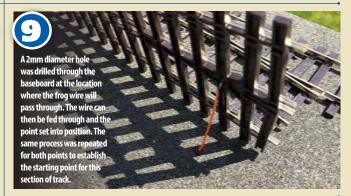
30mm of insulation was removed from 7/0.2 multi-core wire. It was then tinned with solder before being joined to the solder points created on the bottom of the rails with a second heating by a soldering iron. The wire can then be cut back to the outer edges of the two rails.



This process is repeated on both sides of the point – the final result being a pair of neatly attached wires which can be disguised with black paint once the point has been installed and tested. The same process can be applied to '00' gauge points, but extra care will be required to avoid excess heat melting the sleeper web.



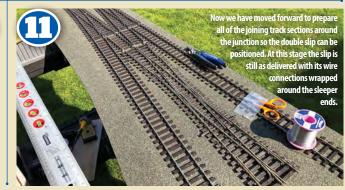
To complete preparations of each point for frog switching, the two link wires at the centre of the frog need to be cut – failure to do this will result in a short circuit.





en employing frog

switching, the centre two rails on points must be isolated using insulated rail joiners. This means that a separate power feed will be required for the inner rail of each section of track following the point.

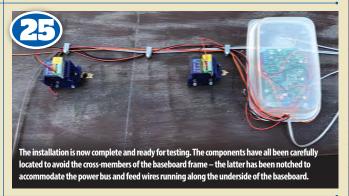
CREATING A SINGLE TRACK REVERSE LOOP WITH A HEX FROG JUICER





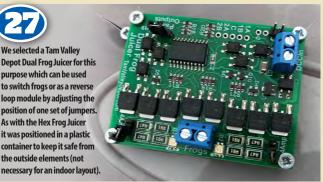


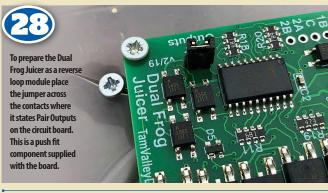
As this installation is going outdoors, the Hex Frog Juicer has been protected in a plastic container. The lid has been screwed to the underside of the baseboard allowing the container to be removed for future maintenance should it be required. Extra wire length has en allowed so the container can be removed – this was all tidied up before installation and the point motors were also covered with modified plastic cups.

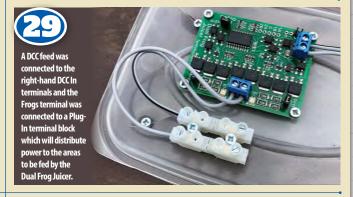




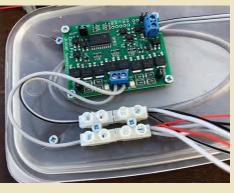
We selected a Tam Valley Depot Dual Frog Juicer for this purpose which can be used to switch frogs or as a reverse loop module by adjusting the position of one set of jumpers. As with the Hex Frog Juicer it was positioned in a plastic container to keep it safe from the outside elements (not

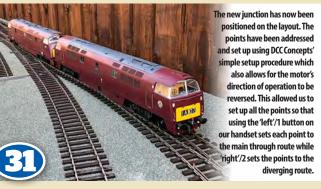

EING 3D scanned by ModelU is one thing but making the most of these fantastically detailed scale figures in paint is another. I was looking to replicate myself in minute detail and through the suggestion of ModelU's Alan Buttler I decided to take advantage of his recommended figure painter Claudia Everett.

Claudia's attention to detail is stunning and when it comes to painting figures it's hard to think of someone better equipped to do the job – and I knew she'd certainly do a better job than me! Having completed my scans at the Great Electric Train Show in 2019 I selected the option to have them professionally painted. This meant that my completed 3D prints were sent directly to Claudia by Alan so that she could replicate my chosen appearance in miniature.

I chose a simple standing pose for the scan for its flexibility on model railways which would model me as I am today in contemporary clothes. This included my then standard exhibition attire of a New Junction branded t-shirt as well as my wrist band for the event. Even these two tiny details were picked out by Claudia in the painting process.

After receiving my figures Claudia got in touch to ask for additional reference images, the most prominent of these being for the shoes that I was wearing that day, as they had a distinctive white sole. These details were applied to the

HE SOUTHERN RAILWAY was born with the Grouping of 1923 and became the smallest of the 'Big Four'. Unlike the others, most of its income came from passenger traffic rather than freight. It was primarily an amalgamation of four main companies - the London and South Western Railway (LSWR), the London, Brighton and South Coast Railway (LBSCR) and two railways in the South East. These were the South Eastern Railway and the London, Chatham and Dover Railway (LCDR) which operated via the South Eastern and Chatham Railways (SECR) Companies Joint Management Committee.

The LSWR operated trains from London Waterloo to the South West including destinations such as Portsmouth, Bournemouth, Southampton, Weymouth, Salisbury, Exeter, Plymouth, Ilfracombe, Barnstaple and Padstow, while the LBSCR ran services from London Victoria and London Bridge to Brighton, Portsmouth, Eastbourne, Newhaven and along





the Sussex coast. SECR trains operated from London Victoria, Charing Cross and Cannon Street to destinations in Sussex, Kent including the channel ports and cross country to Reading.

The areas covered by these companies became the three operational districts, Western, Central and Eastern, throughout the Southern Railway and Southern Region tenure, with many of the locomotives and staff, including rivalries, not straying from their original territories. Indeed, those divisions remain in place to a lesser degree today.

The Southern also inherited from the LSWR the large docks complex at Southampton Docks which as well being a source of freight also

required passenger services to and from the ocean-going liner services. To compete with the increasing competition from the bus and tram network south of the river Thames it created what was at the time the world's largest electrified main line railway system and the first electrified inter-city route.

On the 'juice'

At grouping in 1923 the Southern Railway inherited just over 75 miles of electrified railway - 241/2 of which were the LBSCR 6.7 kV overhead type. In 1926, having already doubled the route mileage powered via 660v DC third-rail, the Southern Railway announced it would standardise on the latter. By the end of 1929, the Southern operated 277 miles of third-rail electric routes. This expansion in the network continued thoughout the 1930s with lines such as London trains), Eastbourne, Portsmouth, Guildford, Reading and Maidstone. This created the world's first modern main line electric network.

It was not only the running lines that were upgraded on the advent of electrification: many major works to improve services such as junction improvements and flyovers were carried out. From the travelling public's perspective, the most visible improvement was in many of the stations being rebuilt using a mix of brick and the latest in concrete construction with precast parts from the Southern's own concrete manufacturing plant at Exmouth Junction. Some of the station designs, including signalboxes, were also very much of the period in Art Deco style such as at Surbiton, Richmond, Woking, Margate, Templecombe and Wimbledon.

Due to this hugely effective mass rapid transit system, the Southern had to manage timetabling to ensure the smooth operation of services and to squeeze its long-distance steam services an intensive service, the Southern introduced a they departed at the same minutes past each hour to help passengers easily remember the

Consolidation & innovation

At Grouping, Richard Maunsell of the SECR became the first Southern Railway Chief Mechanical Engineer. He introduced new and successful designs such as the 'Lord Nelson' (when introduced it was Britain's most powerful 4-6-0) and his masterpiece, the powerful and fast 'Schools' 4-4-0. Initially he set about modifying existing designs such as the LSWR 'N15' 4-6-0s which became better known as the 'King Arthurs' and the 2-6-0'N' and 'U' designs. Maunsell also set about the introduction of modern coaching stock that became the mainstay of main line services until the late 1950s, after which they replaced elderly pre-Grouping stock on secondary services.

The Southern continued the practice of its predecessors in forming coaches into fixed sets,

generally comprising of brake coaches at the outer ends with a combination of Composite, Third or First class coaches between to make sets of differing lengths and allocated to specific services depending on set type. Longer train lengths would be made up from multiple sets as required. The sets were identified by numbers on the outer coach ends and this continued well into the 1960s.

A new order and innovation arrived in 1937 in the shape of Oliver Bulleid, who had been assistant to Nigel Gresley on the London and North Eastern Railway. His first steam locomotives introduced under wartime conditions in 1941 were the first of the eventual 30 'Merchant Navy' class 'Pacifics' which included a partially welded boiler and firebox, chain operated valve gear immersed in an oil bath and his characteristic Bulleid-Firth-Brown cast disc wheels that gave excellent tyre support and combined with the setup of the valve gear did not require balance weights and provided little hammer blow to the track.

His powerful and unusual looking 'Q1' 0-6-0 followed in 1942 and in 1945 the first of the lighter 'West Country' / 'Battle of Britain' 4-6-2s arrived that eventually numbered 110. In keeping with his style, he introduced a continental numbering system for his locomotives based on

the arrangement of leading, trailing and driving wheels so his 'Pacifics' were numbered 21Cxx and his 'Q1' class Cx.

Even his coaching stock was novel, increasing the length to 63ft 6in with its sleek continuous curved profile, spacious open seating sections as well as traditional compartments. The size and layout features of his stock were carried into the design of the British Railways Mk 1s.

As well as steam, Bulleid looked at alternative traction continuing with new EMU stock, utilising similar style and construction as his coaching stock and the introduction in 1941 and 1945 of two main line electric Co-Co locomotives. Initially numbered CC1 and CC2, they became 20001/20002 under British Railways and a third, 20003, was built in 1948.

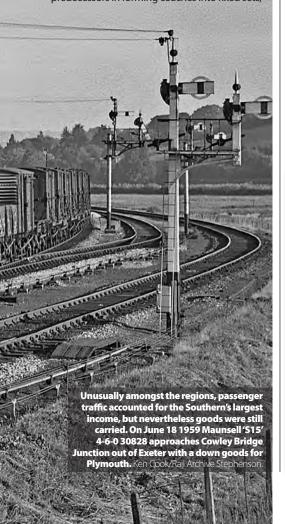
Although design work started before nationalisation, his main line 1-Co-Co-1 diesel engines appeared in 1949 with a third being built in 1953. They utilised a similar bolsterless bogie design as seen on the electric locomotives and operated on the Southern and London Midland Regions well into the 1950s. Many of the design features, especially the bogies, were incorporated into the BR classes 44/45/46.

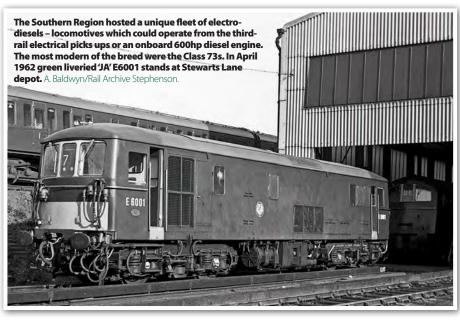
Bulleid's final steam locomotive was the ill-fated and very unconventional 'Leader', first appearing in 1949, that had a cab at each end and two six-wheel power bogies each with three cylinders and therefore looked just like a large diesel locomotive. Only two sets of trials were carried out by which time Bulleid had left the railway and the project was subsequently cancelled, although he continued development of the concept in Ireland.

Named trains

The Southern ran a number of prestige named trains with many continuing right through to the end of steam in the late 1960s. These services included Pullmans such as the 'Devon Belle' complete with observation car, the 'Bournemouth Belle', 'Golden Arrow' to Dover and the 'Brighton Belle'.

The 'Night Ferry', meanwhile, was the only UK service comprising of continental stock that was actually loaded onto a ferry and the whole train travelled to and from mainland Europe. The 'Atlantic Coast Express' was probably the most misnamed of all the Southern named trains but >>>





was a stroke of genius at the same time. Why misnamed? Of the ten different termini served by the train there was only one that was actually on the Atlantic Coast itself – Padstow. The genius of the name, however, a result of a competition run in the Southern Railway staff magazine in 1924 credited to Guard F. Rowland of Woking, was its simple initials 'ACE'.

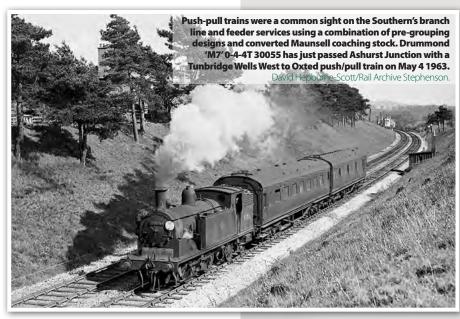
The last of the 'Belles' was the 1948 Saturdays only 'Thanet Belle' from Victoria to Ramsgate via Margate which, in 1951, became the 'Kentish Belle'.

In addition, there were a number of trains which ran solely for the benefit of the ocean liners that docked at Southampton from the USA, South Africa and elsewhere. These trains ran until the 1960s and were often either all Pullman or a mix of stock depending on passenger status and usually carried headboards of the relevant shipping line.

The 'Withered Arm'

The Southern Railway's main line to the West and its many quaint branches, reaching into North Devon, Plymouth and Cornwall, are ideal for modelling. These picturesque routes often saw larger locomotives such as 'T9' 4-4-0s, 'N' 2-6-0s and even Bulleid 'Light Pacifics' hauling short trains of main line coaches which would combine by the time Exeter was reached to form a single express to Waterloo. Trains departing Waterloo, such as the 'Atlantic Coast Express', would comprise of multiple portions, split along the route to reach their various destinations giving each branch direct services to and from London.

These South West services were competing with the Western Region, and control of these lines passed back and forth between the regions in the 1950s resulting in the running down, becoming known as the 'Withered Arm'. The eventual demise of most of the network west



of Exeter/Barnstaple came at the end of the 1960s. There are moves, however, to reinstate the former main line from Exeter to Plymouth via Okehampton and Tavistock, so perhaps before long part of the 'Withered Arm' will carry passengers again.

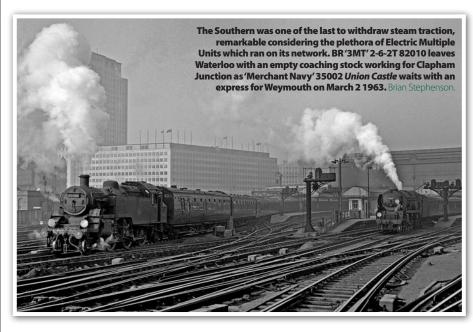
Nationalisation

Many railway companies were struggling since the heroic wartime efforts, but the Southern was still profitable, despite the demands of it geographical area being at the forefront of the war effort and including the movement of troops and materials while suffering much enemy damage. The Railway Executive had effectively taken over all the railways in 1939 and continued to do so in practice until nationalisation in 1948.

New traction policies following the creation of British Railways Southern Region resulted in the introduction of the new breed of BR Standards including the '3MT' 2-6-2Ts, '4MT' 2-6-4Ts, '4MT' 4-6-0s, '5MT' 4-6-0s and heavy freight '9F' 2-10-0s. Even two 'Britannia' 4-6-2s were allocated to Stewarts Lane for a while and could be seen on the 'Golden Arrow'. The entire 'Merchant Navy' class and many of the 'Light Pacifics' were rebuilt after 1956 into a more conventional style in a bid to improve reliability. Their superb boilers and distinctive wheels were retained though, maintaining at least some of their character.

Electrification continued to be the mainstay and its reach expanded. As foreseen by Bulleid, new forms of traction would be preferred to steam long term and new classes of locomotives such as all electric Class 71 Bo-Bos, the Class 33 Bo-Bos and the electro-diesels in the shape of the Class 73 and 74 Bo-Bos appeared. These latter designs could operate at reduced power off the third-rail using their onboard diesel engines.

The introduction of the BR Mk 1 coaches after

1956 saw them replace Maunsell and then Bulleid stock by the end of the 1960s. When in 1957/1958 it became time to replace steam hauled stock on the non-electrified line from London to Hastings via Battle, the Southern Region opted for Diesel Electric Multiple Units (DEMUs). Looking similar to the existing EMUs, these units, classes 201, 202 and 203 had 'Hastings gauge' narrow bodies to accommodate the limited clearance in the tunnels between Tonbridge and Bo-Peep junction and were recognisable by their slab slides. This restricted loading gauge also meant that some of the later Class 33s were also built with a narrower profile.

A further batch of DEMUs was built to the standard EMU profile - the Class 205s, for use on other non-electrified lines in Hampshire, Kent, and between Salisbury and Reading. The final batch of DEMUs, and the last based on the BR Mk 1, design was the Class 207 introduced in 1962 for the Oxted line.

The end of steam came later on the Southern Region than most in 1967, when the last of the

remaining Bulleid 'Pacifics' were finally replaced by Class 33s, 42s and 47s and subsequently on boat train services the Class 74 electro-diesels could be seen.

A distinct legacy

There was far more to the Southern Region than just EMUs, Bulleid 'Pacifics' and Pullman trains. Through this supplement we will show you how to create your own realistic model of the Southern Region. Ranging from replicating the EMU services with its distinctive third-rail, long distance multiple portion steam services, luxurious Pullman and boat trains, the quaint branch lines, a prominence of green both in stock, signage and building paintwork.

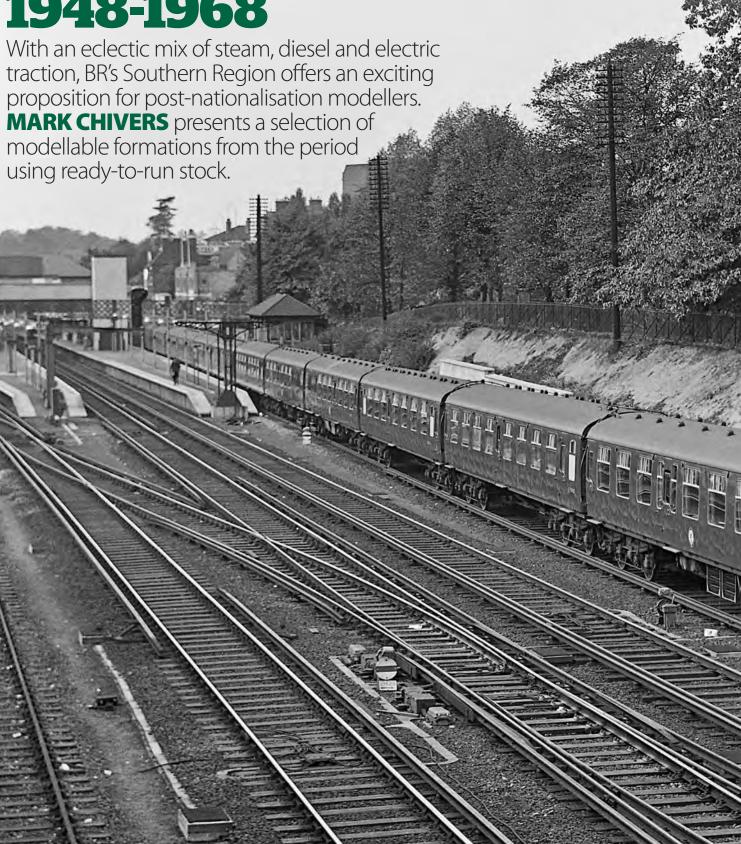
The Southern Region was full of quirky variety and in model form we have seen a massive increase over the last 10 years in the number of models and products available. There are still some gaps to be filled, but creating a realistic picture of many aspects of the region is possible, as we shall show.

SOUTHERN REGION

1948-1968





RITISH RAILWAYS' (BR) Southern Region territory covered a huge swathe of Southern England from south London to Kent. Sussex, Surrey, Hampshire and Dorset with extensions along the West of England line to North Devon and Cornwall. Operations covered suburban, outer suburban, long-distance, secondary and branch line passenger services plus a great deal of freight too, including pick-up goods, trip freights, mixed goods, milk, cement, coal, oil, military traffic, cross-channel and maritime freight, parcels and much more. This resulted in a very busy rail network, operated by an ageing fleet of steam locomotives and rolling stock immediately following nationalisation.

Not surprisingly, the bulk of the Southern Region's remit was commuter traffic to and from London, while holiday traffic offered an additional bonus with many South Coast resorts served, which not only generated 'in-region' custom but plenty of inter-regional traffic from across the country during the summer months.

Third-rail electrification schemes helped improve reliability and capacity, with expanding fleets of Electric Multiple Units (EMUs) and Diesel-Electric Multiple Units (DEMUs) gradually replacing the ageing steam locomotives and rolling stock. New electric and diesel locomotives were also introduced to bolster the EMUs and DEMUs, as some routes remained non-electrified and new motive power was also required for freight.

Southern modellers have been particularly well-served by the main manufacturers in recent times with new locomotive releases including Bachmann's 'H1' and 'H2' 4-4-2s, Hornby's 'OO' gauge LBSCR 'Terrier' 0-6-0T, SR 'Lord Nelson' 4-6-0 and SR air-smoothed 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2, Dapol's 'B4' 0-4-0T, 'Terrier' 0-6-0T (Rails of Sheffield) and more. Even prototypes such as Bulleid's 1-Co-Co-1 (KMRC) and the LMS 'Twins' 10000/10001 Co-Co diesels (Bachmann), which ran on Southern metals for a while in the early 1950s, are available ready-to-run.

Signature electric and diesel locomotives include Hornby/DJ Models' Class 71 electric, Dapol's Class 73 electro-diesel and Heljan's Class 33/0, 33/1 and 33/2 diesels. KR Models is also looking for expressions of interest in Bulleid's Leader 0-6-0+0-6-0 for 'OO'. (see pages 24-29 for a full listing).

Modellers of the Southern Electric scene can choose from Bachmann's Class 419 Motor Luggage Van, 4-CEP, 2-EPB and 2-H units, Hornby's 2-BIL, 2-HAL, 5-BEL and 4-VEP EMUs, KMRC's exclusive Class 438 4-TC units and more. To add to the multiple unit fleet, Bachmann's long-awaited 2-HAP EMU is due for release later this summer, while a 4-BEP EMU with newly tooled catering vehicle is also due for release soon.

In terms of rolling stock, Hornby's roster includes Maunsell 58ft rebuilt non-corridor stock, Maunsell corridor stock, Maunsell Pull-Push sets, BR Mk 1 carriages and recently

introduced Bulleid 59ft corridor coaches. In addition, its well-received Maunsell Restaurant Car offers a very useful vehicle, while the impressive collection of Pullman cars includes eight-wheel and 12-wheel examples.

Bachmann's range covers Bulleid 63ft main line carriages which are due to be replaced shortly with a set of all-new vehicles including a Corridor Third (TK), Corridor Composite (CK), Semi-Open Brake Third (BTK) and, for the first time, a Corridor Brake Composite (BCK) – a useful model for West of England formations. The manufacturer's impressive SECR'Birdcage' stock is offered in a choice of liveries, while its extensive BR Mk 1 and Mk 2 range should cater for most requirements - there's even a BR Mk 2 FK in BR green to help replicate the Southampton Docks boat trains. Replica Railways offers BR Mk 1 64ft suburban coaches while Kernow Model Rail Centre's delightful London & South Western Railway (LSWR) 'Gate Stock' provides added variety for branch line operation.

From a freight perspective, there is a good selection of ready-to-run revenue and departmental wagons available in 'OO' with 12ton ventilated vans, fruit vans, meat vans, Conflats, open wagons, six-wheel milk tanks, 22ton 'Presflo' wagons, bogie bolsters, hopper wagons, engineers vehicles, fuel tanks and more. Heljan's 35ton Class A and Class B tanks will come in useful for those wishing to replicate oil traffic to/from Fawley, near Southampton, while Bachmann's recent introduction of its Ransomes and Rapier 45ton Breakdown Crane offers further variety with the opportunity to model a realistic breakdown train - their SR grey model is based on SR prototype 1561S, which remained in service into the late 1980s. To top things off, Hornby's recently released LSWR 20ton/24ton brake vans will prove handy as will Bachmann's SR 25ton 'Pill Box' and SR 25ton 'Queen Mary' types. Bachmann's versatile SR Covered Carriage Truck/Parcels and Miscellaneous Van (CCT/ PMV), plus BR Mk 1 CCT, General Utility Van (GUV), Gangwayed Brake (BG), along with a Stanier 50ft BG and SR Bogie Van B from Hornby provide ample parcels stock.

Given the intense nature of BR Southern Region operations, the following selection of train formations is certainly not exhaustive but aims to shine a light on the varied passenger and freight services that operated in the 1950s and 1960s. Where possible, full formations have been shown, however in some cases where passenger trains exceed ten vehicles and freight formations exceed 30 wagons, selective compression has been applied to keep modellable train lengths manageable. With a mix of steam, diesel and electric traction, the formations shown should enable you to model your own slice of the Southern Region in the 1950s and '60s.

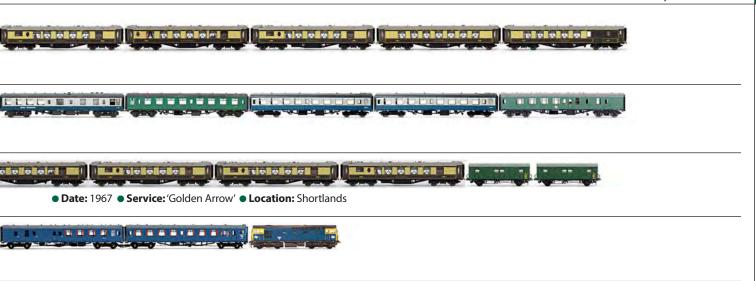


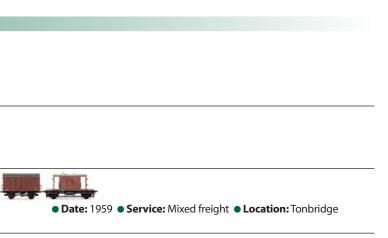

A notable feature of Southern Region operations from the 1950s and 1960s was the continued use of Engine Head Signals on locomotives. MARK CHIVERS outlines how these distinctive white discs worked and offers a selection of examples.

NGINE HEAD SIGNALS were a form of route indicator disc used on the Southern to help identify the route each train was to take. The system was maintained into the British Railways era for steam traction.

Whereas other regions used illuminated lamps or discs to identify the type of train, the Southern Region continued to display a series of 15in diameter white discs at the head of its locomotivehauled trains to display its intended route.

The system was based on six lamp bracket positions, upon which the discs would be

attached, depending on the duty worked. Many permutations were possible with each one assigned a series of routes, albeit split between different areas of the region, to prevent misinterpretation. This helped identify the route a train was headed in point to point form and was applicable to passenger, goods, special trains, empty stock, light engine moves and other workings. At night, lamps were utilised in the same positions.

If you wish to model engine head signals in 'OO', a small hole punch will provide a costeffective supply of white discs from thin plastic

sheet or there are also sets of 4mm etched brass items available from 247 Developments (Cat No. G20 (unpainted)/G20P (painted)) and Roxey Mouldings (4A109).

The above selection of indicators show the system in use in model form on a Hornby 'West Country'. We have only included a maximum of three possible routes with each permutation, although most of the positions shown covered many more routes across the Southern.

20 Southern

What are the signatures of the Southern Region, and how can you model them?

MIKE WILD

offers his top 20 tips for recreating the smallest BR region in miniature.

1. BULLEID PACIFICS

The radical design of Bulleid's air-smoothed 4-6-2s, and their later rebuilt form, are a key part of almost every size of Southern Region layout. They were seen system wide and the 'West Country'/'Battle of Britain' classes were even seen on short trains in North Cornwall as well

as long expresses and Pullman workings. There was nothing like a Bulleid 'Pacific' and now all four versions are available ready-to-run in 'OO' gauge – air-smoothed and rebuilt 'Merchant Navys' plus the air-smoothed and rebuilt 'West Country'/'Battle of Britain' classes.





The Southern has the largest expanse of thirdrail electrification on the British railway network and its steam era multiple units were as much a hallmark of the region as Bulleid 'Pacifics' and concrete structures.

A huge number of designs spanning back to the 1930s could be seen in service during the

BR steam era consisting of two, three, four, five and six-car units. The fleet even included the world's only all-electric Pullman train – the trio of 'Brighton Belle' five-car units.

Nationalisation brought new designs and a number of pre and post-BR era units are now available ready-to-run for 'OO' gauge. Hornby offers the 2-BIL, 2-HAL, 4-VEP and 5-BEL while Bachmann has released models of the single car MLV, 2-EPB and 4-CEP with further models of the 2-HAP and 4-BEP due soon. EMU formations also saw units operate in multiple including up to 13 car formations for Dover boat trains made up of MLV, 4-CEP, 4-BEP and 4-CEP stock.



The Southern Railway was adept at reusing materials and a common feature of the lineside were its signals on posts made from redundant rails. Dapol offers Home and Distant signals in this style fully working for 'OO' gauge while Ratio and Model Signal Engineering produce kits for the same type of signals as well as twin arm Home signals.



Green was the colour for the Southern, but there were a number of different shades. Initially locomotives carried lined Malachite green on the transition from Southern Railway to BR Southern Region, often with Bulleid 'Sunshine' lettering for the British Railways legend on side tanks and tenders. This then gave way to BR lined express blue for 27 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s prior to the widespread introduction of BR's standard lined green colour scheme for passenger locomotives.

Coaching stock was green too – though carmine and cream and plain carmine could be seen during the early 1950s – although many coaches including those of pre-nationalisation origin simply gained a fresh coat of varnish to rejuvenate the original body colour. Multiple units were green too while station furniture took on the family colour scheme. Station buildings and lineside structures were usually finished in middle chrome green and cream where wooden panelling was involved.

Richard Maunsell became the Chief Engineer at the creation of the Southern Railway in 1923 and his locomotive designs continued to serve the region

Railway in 1923 and his locomotive designs continued to serve the region after nationalisation. They had a familiar family appearance and an increasing range is available ready-to-run for 'OO' gauge including the 'King Arthur', 'Lord Nelson' and 'S15' 4-6-0s, 'N' 2-6-0s and 'Schools' 4-4-0. All but the 'N' are part of the Hornby range with the 2-6-0 being a Bachmann product. In a classic scene outside Stewarts Lane depot in 1956, North British built 'King Arthur' 4-6-0 30768 Sir Balin shows its Maunsell styling including smokebox design, smoke deflector shape, parallel boiler and round topped firebox and eight-wheel bogie tender. Railphotoprints.uk.





The Southampton Docks complex was an important traffic source for the Southern, both for passengers and freight. The railway system had its own fleet of locomotives and, remarkably, three of those are now

available as ready-to-run models for 'OO' gauge – the Adams 'B4' 0-4-0T from Dapol, the 'USA' 0-6-0T from Bachmann and the Class 07 diesel shunter from Heljan. These short wheelbase locomotives make attractive signatures for a model of the Southampton Docks area, but they were also seen on other parts of its network as depot pilots and works shunters.

Other docks such as Dover and

Newhaven made use of short wheelbase shunters such as the diminutive 'Terriers' and 'P' 0-6-0Ts that are also available ready-to-run from Hornby, Rails of Sheffield and Hattons.

7. CONCRETE EVERYTHING

The Southern made great use of pre-cast concrete products across its network and even had its own concrete works near Exmouth Junction shed. Concrete features included platform edging, lamps, station nameboards, benches, footbridges and even fencing products for the railway network.

Another common site was the concrete platelayers hut, also a product of the Exmouth Junction works, these were designed to be able to be transported, in one piece minus the chimney, on a well wagon easily anywhere on the network. A wide range of these features are available as kits and parts to create a

realistic Southern Region setting. Look to the Ratio range for many of these items as plastic kits including footbridges, fencing, concrete lamps and platelayer's huts while Peco makes concrete platform edging components. Dart Castings produce concrete platform bench components in white metal too.





If you are modelling the Southern and its 750v DC network then you need third-rail. Happily all the components are available to replicate this distinctive feature through Peco. It offers separate lengths of code 60 rail (Cat No. IL-1) as well as conductor rail chairs (IL-120). The latter can be fitted into 1mm diameter holes in every fifth sleeper end, though care will be needed around point work to follow prototype practice.

9. CARRIAGE SETS

Carriage formations were a feature of the Southern as it marshalled sets including two, three and five-car fixed formations which had numbers on their outer ends. There were individual vehicles too, but the fixed formations extended to Maunsell, Bulleid and Mk 1 stock. Hornby has produced three-car . Maunsell corridor sets in the past while the Bachmann 'Birdcage' coaches are offered as individual vehicles which make up authentic sets. The new Bulleid 59ft coaches from Hornby have also been offered as vehicles to make prototypical three-car sets. All of the formations have brake coaches at the outer ends



with typical arrangements being Brake Composite-Brake Second for two-car trains, Brake Second-Composite-Brake Second for a three-coach set and Brake Second-Second-Composite-Second-Brake Second for fivecar trains.

10. ELECTRO-DIESELS

A unique form of traction on the region were its electro-diesels – locomotives which could operate using the 750v DC third rail system as well as with a smaller on board diesel engine when away from the electric supply. The first design of this type were the Class 73s – originally classified 'JA' and 'JB'. These were joined by the Class 74s which were rebuilt from Class 71 electrics in 1967-1968. The Class 74s were short lived and

haven't been produced ready-torun while the Class 73 is a current model from Dapol which has been released in a number of liveries covering the classes history from 1962 to the present day. Another essential part of the Southern scene which can be used on layouts with and without third-rail equipment. Green liveried 'JA' E6001 stands at Stewarts Lane depot in April 1962. A. Pull - Push trains, as they were known on the Southern, were a common feature – and on main lines as well as branch lines. Common formations including the 1960s converted Maunsell twocar sets which were seen in the hands of 'M7' and 'H' 0-4-4Ts while earlier designs such as the LSWR 'Gatestock' survived into the 1960s to be hauled by 'H' and 'O2' 0-4-4Ts. Both of these carriage types have been produced ready-to-run by Hornby and Kernow Model Rail Centre (KMRC) respectively.
For a more modern push-pull working look no further than the KMRC 4-TC trailer units which operated on the London-Bournemouth-Weymouth route from 1967 onwards. Initially they

were pushed and pulled by Class 73s on the third rail network while beyond Bournemouth a fleet of push-pull equipped Class 33/1s were introduced from 1966, following trials with D6580 in 1965.



Like every region, the Southern had a number of titled trains in its daily timetable as well as the boat trains which served ocean lines at Southampton Docks. Highlights include the 'Atlantic Coast Express', 'Man of Kent', 'Cunarder', 'Night Ferry' and the 'Royal Wessex'.

All of these trains can be modelled with Sankey Scenics extensive range of printed carriage titled train packs which include headboards, carriage roof boards and gangway covers printed on high quality card. Alternatively, Fox Transfers offers a number of etched brass headboards for titled trains.

13. LINESIDED STAILS

A great source of lineside and station platform details is Dart Castings. Its range comprises station bench components, region specific ground signals, station nameboards, cast metal lamps from the Southern's pre-1923 constituent companies, platform supports and more. There are also Southern Region theme station signs available from Sankey Scenics and working Southern Region lamps – including the barley twist design – in the Gaugemaster collection.

14. ART DECO AND ODEON STYLES

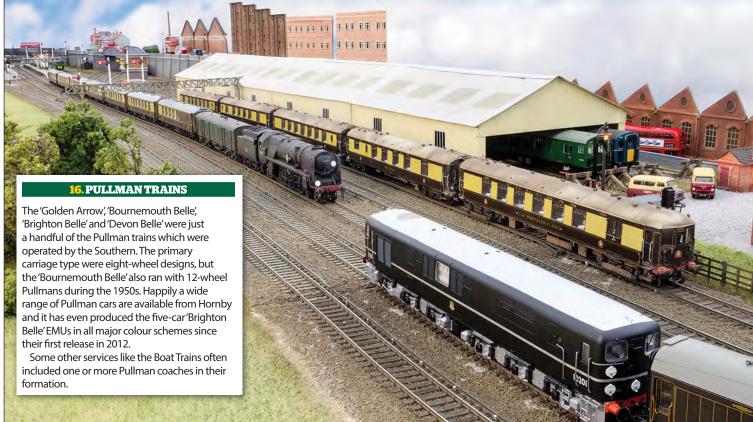


The Southern received new building styles in the 1930s with the arrival of art deco and Odeon styles. Surviving examples of the art deco style are Surbiton, Richmond and Margate stations while Odeon style buildings included signalboxes at Templecombe, Wimbledon and Bognor Regis. Bachmann have included some of this style of buildings in their Scenecraft range.

15. DEMUS

Unique amongst the BR multiple unit fleet were the Southern's Diesel Electric Multiple Units (DEMUs). Several designs were built including the Class 205 two and three-car units which are part of the Bachmann range. In addition there were narrow bodied six-car units for the restricted width of the tunnels on the Hastings line while later in the 1960s the 205s were joined by Class 207 units which had a revised front end layout with domed roofs and recessed multiple working jumpers.





17. ENGINE HEAD SIGNALS

You can't model Southern steam locomotives without the Engine Head Signals which were used to identity the route of a train. These were indicated using six lamp iron positions

on the leading end of steam locomotives

– and even the Bulleid diesels. You can
read more about these important features
on page 16. Here Bulleid 'Q1' 0-6-0 33006

Modelling the Southern doesn't just mean long trains and 'Pacifics' or endless EMUs. The 'Withered Arm' in North Cornwall and branch lines could see single carriage trains, and occasionally hauled by Bulleid 'Pacifics'. These short trains included portions of the 'Atlantic Coast Express' which divided along its route for passengers to reach their final destination. Equally it was

common for branches, like that to Lyme Regis, to see single coach trains hauled by Victorian Adams '0415' 4-4-2Ts. The Maunsell carriages and Southern branch line motive power are all available from Hornby. On June 2 1963 'Battle of Britain' 34072 257 Squadron calls at Pinhoe with a two-coach 12.42pm Exeter Central-Honiton working. Mike Fox/Rail Archive Stephenson.



Bulleid's 'Pacifics' were just one of the Southern's remarkable Chief Mechanical Engineers' designs. The Southern also saw the introduction of the unmistakable 'Q1'0-6-0 during the Second World War while shortly after nationalisation Bulleid's first diesel-electrics 10201 and 10202 (later joined by 10203) entered service, paving the way for the Class 44-46 diesel designs.

All of these locomotives are available ready-to-run with the 'Q1' being in the Hornby stable and the Bulleid diesels produced by KMRC as exclusive models. Recently KR Models has revealed its plans to produce a ready-to-

run 'OO' gauge model of Bulleid's most radical steam locomotive for the British main line network – Leader. This twin cab 0-6-0+0-6-0 steam locomotive took modern steam design to new levels, but wasn't successful and only one was built.

Also worth mentioning are Bulleid's carriage designs. His 63ft 6in main line stock paved the way for the British Railway's Mk 1 series and new versions are currently in development with Bachmann for 'OO'. In 1953 Bulleid prototype diesel-electric 10201 approaches Vauxhall with the Down 'Bournemouth Belle'. John Day Collection/Railphotoprints.uk.

20. CEMENT, OIL AND VANS

Mixed goods and coal were staples of Southern freight, but its signatures were cement, fuel/oil and van trains – the latter catering for seasonal banana traffic through Southampton Docks amongst other flows.

Cement trains ran both within the region in Presflo wagons as well as starting in Kent and running north onto the Eastern and Midland regions using Cemflo cement tankers. These trains were hauled by 'Q1' 0-6-0s, Bulleid 'Light Pacifics' and Class 33s.

Fawley oil refinery near

Southampton offered regular train loads of fuel and oil in Class A (fuel) and Class B (oil) tankers running to other parts of the country. These were well known for haulage by single and pairs of BRCW Class 33s as well as '9Fs' on the Southern. Wagons to model these trains are available ready-torun from Accurascale, Bachmann Heljan and Hornby.

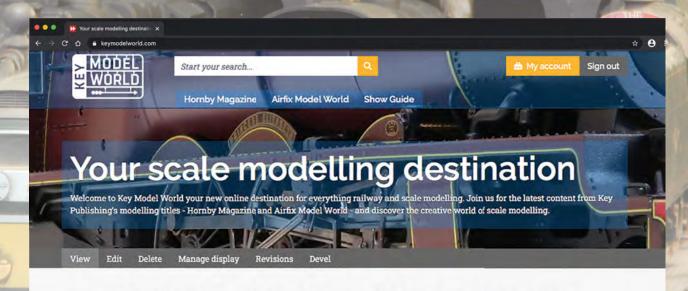

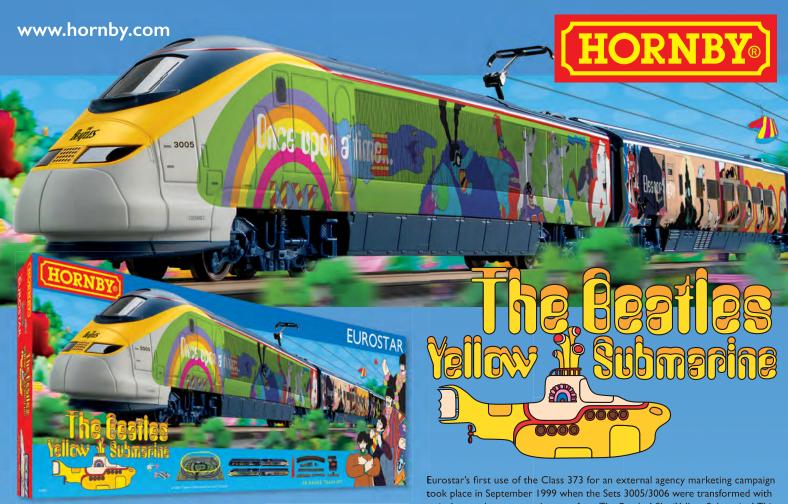
