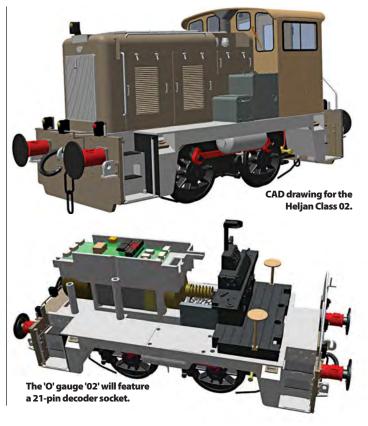
The Class 02s were introduced in 1960 and 20 were built. They carried numbers D2850-D2869 and were withdrawn from service between 1969 and 1975. Most went into industrial service with the last being retired in the 1980s. Seven have been preserved including D2860 at the National Railway Museum.

The dock shunting locomotives, which were well suited to tight curves due to their 6ft wheelbase, will be offered in a range of BR and industrial colour schemes. The specification calls for all-wheel drive and electrical pick-up, switchable cab lights, LED marker

lights, a 21-pin DCC decoder socket and space for digital sound. Externally, the Class 02s are to have detail variations, a detailed cab interior and underframe, separate handrails, door handles and pipework plus etched Yorkshire Engine Co. worksplates.

Eight models are planned for release in 'O' gauge - the 'OO' versions are due to be announced separately - covering the following colour schemes: BR green unnumbered with wasp stripes (Cat No. 2870), D2860 in BR green with wasp stripes (2871), 02004 in BR green with wasp stripes, no BR logos and a weathered finish (2872), 02003 in BR blue with wasp stripes (2873), Redland Khaki (ex-D2867) (2874), Industrial all-over yellow with wasp stripes (2875), NCB Staffordshire Area pale blue ND3 (2876) and Industrial green 'SAM' (2877).

CAD drawing for the 'O' gauge Class 02 is complete and tooling is under way to allow the first releases to reach Heljan stockists in the final quarter of 2021.

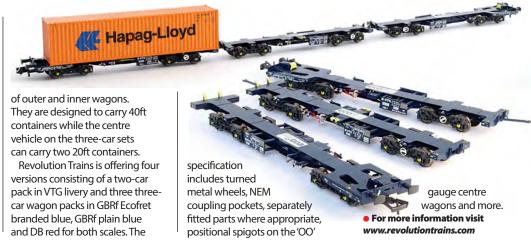

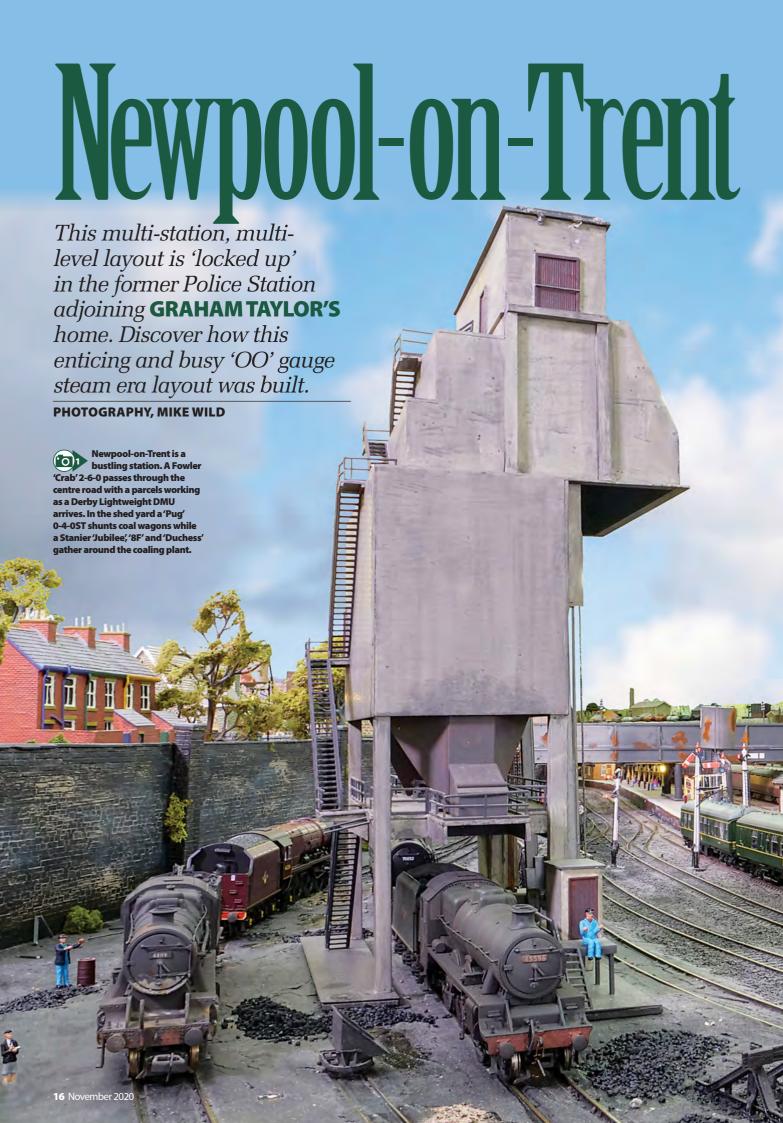


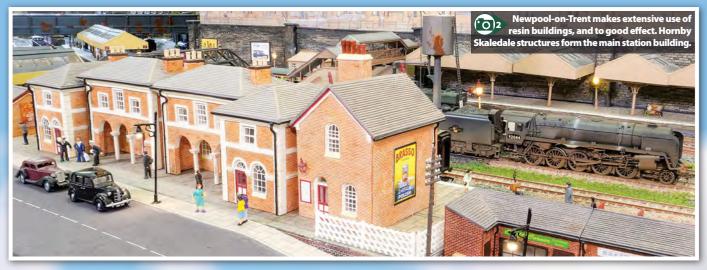






PAINT EASY THE HARDER WAY





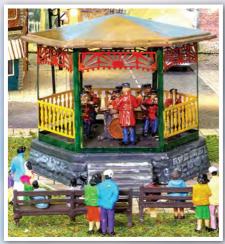
EWPOOL ON TRENT (change for Gravalli and Capel Road) is a fictitious location somewhere in the Midlands where the London Midland & Scottish Railway and Great Western Railway met. It is set in the 1960s, the final decade of steam.

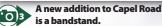
Gravalli and Capel Road are the GWR stations on the layout, while Newpool-on-Trent is mainly LMS with a connection to the GWR lines. Gravalli is made up from my name GRAham and my wife's name VALerie and a LI on the end to give a Welsh name, Gravalli. I built the layout, which is housed in a room on the ground level in a former police station which adjoins our house. The layout is a permanent feature and cannot be

broken down for exhibition purposes.

I have always had an interest in model railways and can remember going to the Manchester Model Railway show at the Corn Exchange in the city at an early age. As a spotter, I spent a lot of time at Longsight shed, Manchester, where I would spot 'Patriots', 'Jubilees', 'Royal Scots' and many others. This gave me a love of the LMS and trips to Wales with my parents for holidays gave me a passion for the GWR.

My first train set was a Triang 'Princess Elizabeth' with a couple of 'blood and custard' coaches. Since then I have always dabbled in model railways on a small scale. However, in 2001 we had a house move, and with the former police station area available I had an ideal space to build a large model railway which I started in 2004.>>









DESIGNING THE LAYOUT

To design the layout, I made a list of what I wanted to see on it. On the LMS section, or main line as I call it, I wanted a large station, locomotive depot, goods yard, canal with a lock and a town scene leading out to the country. On the GWR branch section I wanted a small country station and goods yard.

First, I made a drawing to scale of the useable area and then plotted the size of baseboards I needed. I then drew up some basic track plans and I made the baseboards from 70mm x 15mm softwood framing topped with 10mm thick plywood. Finally, it was covered with 10mm thick Sundeala board. The boards are a nominal 4ft long x 2ft 6in wide, but some are larger due to the shape of the room to work around recesses. The widest board is 4ft which is no problem because it can be viewed from both sides. The whole layout is supported by legs made from 45mm square softwood which are fitted with kitchen base unit adjustable feet from a DIY shop. All the baseboards are doweled and bolted together.

Before I started in earnest laying track, I played around with Peco turnout templates by printing out copies from the internet. This made me aware that you can soon run out of space. I then started to lay the main lines using Peco code 100 track and Peco Streamline live frog turnouts with either Peco or SEEP point motors and switches to change the $\bar{\text{frog}}$ polarity. The double track forms a large oval with four roads through the main station, Newpool-on-Trent, where there is a bay platform and goods yard on the Down side. There is also a six-road locomotive shed which has an allocation of 55 engines, a Heljan turntable which works well, a sanding plant and lifting hoist with associated concrete coaling tower and ash plant. On the opposite side to the station there is a 17-road storage yard, nine lines of which can hold eight-coach trains.

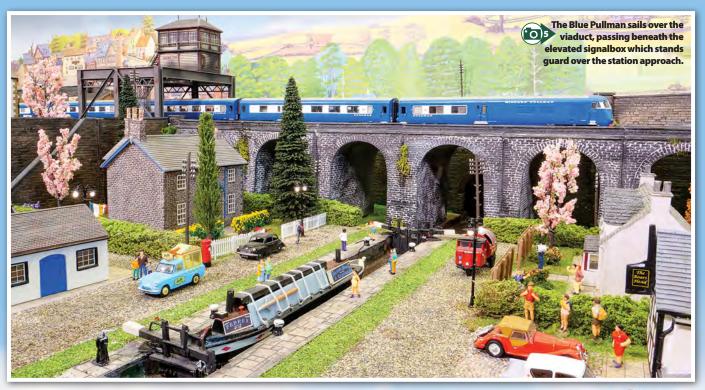
Next to be constructed was the branch, which grew in size due to more operating scope being realised from my original plan. First came Gravalli, a branch terminus with a bay for an autotrain, goods yard and timber yard and single road engine shed. This is at a higher level than the main line and crosses at right angles via a girder bridge over the platforms of the main line station. The line then follows the main line but also falls on a gradient to reach a platform at Newpool-on-Trent station.

I then decided to extend the branch to another station, Capel Road, which meant the line had to rise up a gradient to a new base board I built above the storage yard. Capel Road has a bay for an autotrain, goods yard, single road engine shed and private siding to a dairy. Now I had an end to end run from Gravalli to Capel Road via Newpool-on-Trent where the configuration of points allowed the branch to crossover to the main line.

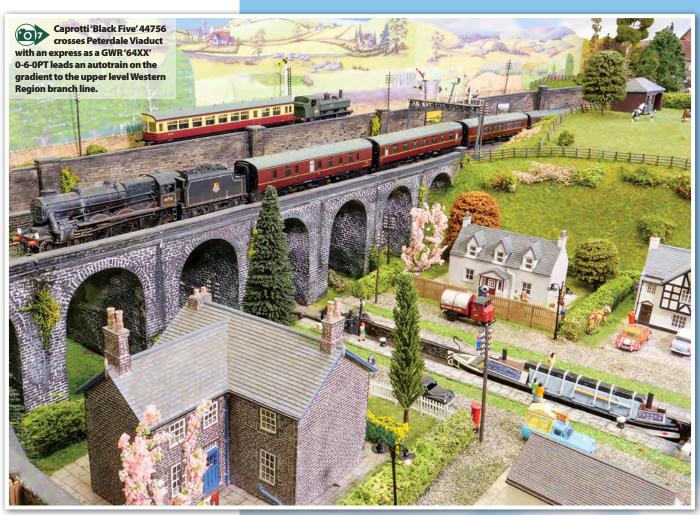
One of my close friends and professional railwayman, Bob Hart who is a main line steam traction inspector, has seen the progress of my construction on a weekly basis and has been like a technical advisor to me during the build. His experience of the 'big railway' has been invaluable. One of Bob's suggestions was to extend the line at Capel Road to make it a through station and join up with the line coming out of Gravalli. This made it a continuous loop with a branch off to Gravalli. A continuous loop was acceptable due to the size of the layout. Bob's next suggestion was to add a left-hand chord at the exit to Gravalli to join the continuous loop close to Capel Road to form a triangle. I added the chord and when operating the branch some interesting moves can be made. At Gravalli terminus, a locomotive can be turned on the triangle. I found that as I was constructing the branch that unplanned modifications were made, which made the construction >>>









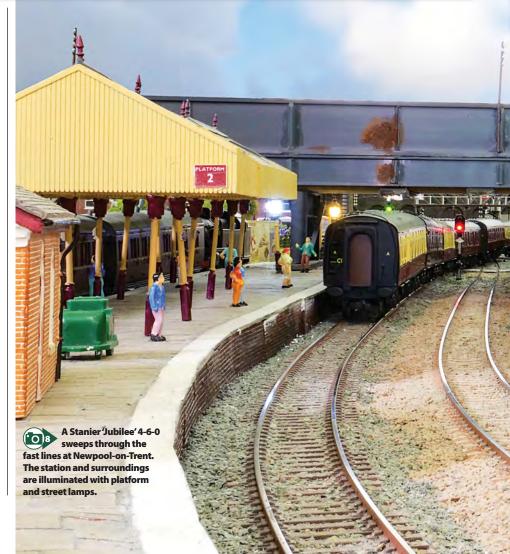


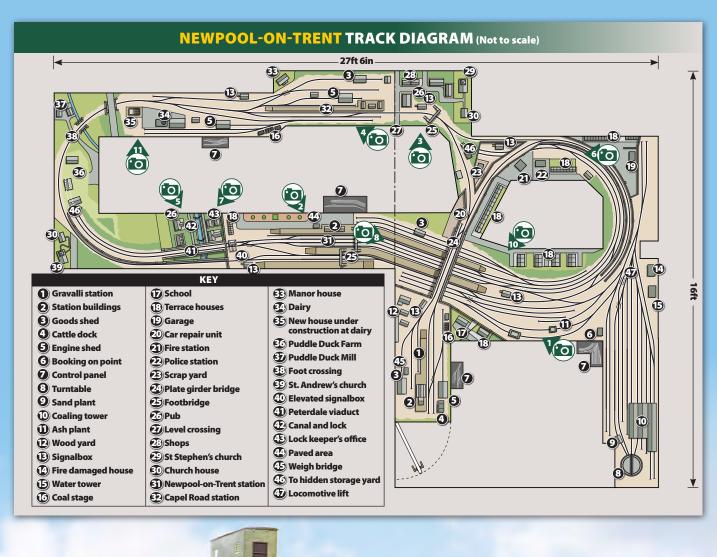
more interesting as it developed.

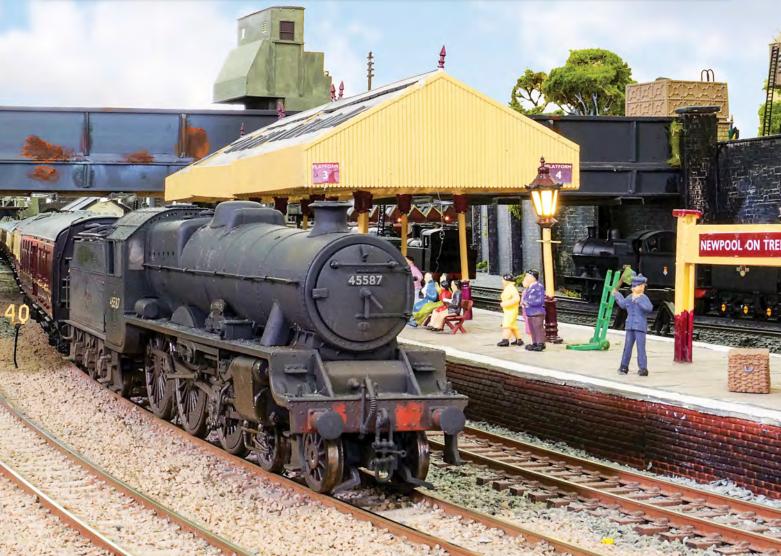
The track is mostly wooden sleeper style with some concrete sleeper track on the through main fast lines at Newpool-on-Trent. This shows that the track was sometimes upgraded when required. I think it is very effective. After wiring, constructing control panels and testing the track, it was airbrushed with Railmatch dark rust enamel paint. Jarvis 'N' gauge granite ballast was used on the wooden sleeper track while limestone chippings were used with the concrete sleeper track to represent clean ballast.

CONTROL AND SIGNALS

The layout is analogue with four control panels and all controllers are Gaugemaster. The main panel has two controllers, one for the Up line and one for the Down line which are wired for cab control. The panel has a track plan which is broken into colour coded sections and each has a switch to either isolate it or select which cab (controller) to use. The turnouts are switched by pressing a contact button and there is a capacitor discharge unit for point operation.







Trains. Again, an LED lights up on the main panel when a storage yard road is occupied. I have found the Heathcote Electronic products are robust and work well. They certainly work well in my off-scene yard where I am working blind.

At Gravalli and Capel Road and the engine shed there are similar panels, although there are no LED point position indicators and the engine shed uses stud and probe to change the points instead of push buttons.

On the main line, signals are three aspect coloured light signals apart from a non working gantry with upper quadrant semaphore signals. The coloured light signals are by Eckon and some have route indicator feathers which look impressive. The branch has GWR lower quadrant semaphore signals. Some are Ratio non-working kit-built examples while others are Dapol working signals.

SETTING THE SCENE

Buildings are out of the box to save time, Hornby Skaledale or Bachmann Scenecraft. Station buildings for the GWR stations have been highlighted in

GWR dark and light stone paint. Station canopies are Dapol and Ratio. I made the station platforms from MDF cut to suit. The main line platforms are curved, so in order to obtain a good finish on the internal radius, I used a spoke shave,

which I enjoyed using having not used one for years. The platforms were finished with Wills embossed paving material.

There are several signalboxes on the layout. I wanted a large 'box at Newpool-on-Trent station. I took two Hornby



signalboxes, removed the steps from one of the boxes then glued them both together. For another 'box on the main line, I made a structure to elevate it over the lines using Plastruct steel section.

The long plate girder bridge which passes over the main line for Gravalli station is made up from plastic steel components by E.M.I Model Supplies. For landscaping hills, I used offcuts of Kingspan Insulation as it is easy to shape and does not make too much mess. It was covered with plaster bandage, painted brown and static grass was applied.

The canal with lock, I think, is a nice feature going under Peterdale Viaduct in the valley while the lock gates are a Langley product. There is also a pub in the valley. Other features to note are St Andrew's Church, with a wedding taking place and Puddle Duck Farm, with a foot crossing over the branch leading to Puddle Duck Mill. Nearby is a dairy with private sidings. The owner is having a new house built on site. At Capel Road stands another church, St Stephen's. In the town area are rows of terraced houses, a

police station and fire station. A garage is to be found under one of the railway high level arches with an arc welding set being used where blue flashes can be seen. In total there are 70 working street, platform and yard lights supplied by Layouts 4U.

THE FLEET

The locomotive fleet includes 58 LMS, 25 GWR, 23 LNER, 10 SR and 16 BR Standard steam locomotives, with diesels consisting of a Bachmann 'Midland Pullman' and 'Derby Lightweight' diesel multiple unit. I have some London and North Eastern Railway and Southern Railway locomotives because I like locomotives from all regions. These are run now and again as inter-regional specials.

My favourite steam locomotive in the collection is a Comet kit of Caprotti valve gear 'Black Five' 44756, built by Dave Ocock from Bristol. I used to see many of these when I was a spotter around Manchester. Dave also built me a DJH kit model of BR Standard '8P' 71000 Duke of Gloucester before Hornby released its version. I have rakes of coaches from all regions and an assortment of goods wagons.

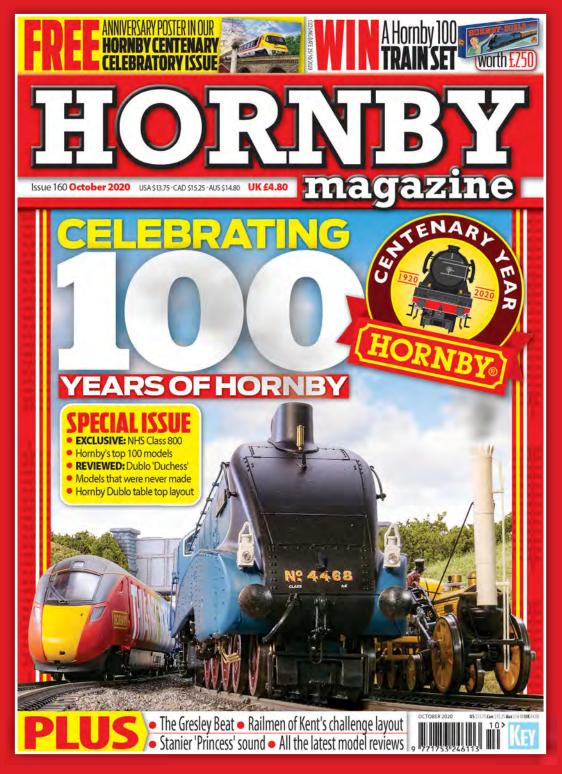
I don't have an operating procedure yet as most of my time has been spent on building the layout. At present, I just run trains for the joy of seeing them moving. One of my favourite trains is an LMS '8F' pulling a rake of Hatton's ICI hopper wagons. I used to see these going through South Manchester on their way to Northwich.

LEARNING CURVE

The experience of building a large layout has been wonderful. I have learnt a lot about the hobby and am proud of what I have achieved by myself. As for the future, a railway is never finished. I want to weather more of the locomotives and rolling stock, having only done a few to date. I also intend to add crew and lights to locomotives plus lots of other little tasks.

I would like to thank the model railway shop owners for their advice on products - particularly Les at Haslington Models, Richard at Trident Trains and Derek at Footplate Models. Last but not least thank you to my wife Valerie for her encouragement and advice on scenery during the build. She comes from a railway family where most of her relations were employed at Crewe Works. Her father worked in the erecting shop at Crewe Works and I have his Certificate of Apprenticeship signed by Charles Fairburn in a frame hanging in my model railway room.

Before BILUIE

The change to BR's new corporate blue colour scheme didn't happen overnight, and there were many variations. **TIM SHACKLETON** wanders into the minefield of blue liveries in the pre-TOPS era.

HERE'S a lot of confusion among modellers about the change to blue livery for locomotives, carriages and multiple units that took place from the mid-1960s on. It didn't happen overnight – there were still some locomotives (mostly 08s and 20s) in green with TOPS numbers at the very end of the 1970s. A variety of shades and interpretations was apparent until Rail Blue was settled on and even then, there were many differences in the supposedly standardised application.

In the immediate aftermath of nationalisation there had been similar experiments with steam locomotives and for a while a rich mid-blue had been the preferred livery, lined out in black and white, for express passenger locomotives. From 1959 onwards 25kV electric locomotives on the Western Lines of the London Midland Region were delivered in their own unique shade of Electric Blue and in 1961 one of the Eastern Region's Brush Type 2s was painted in a similar colour as an

experiment. In the early 1960s there was a further round of research and ever since modellers have been asking the same questions.

To set the record straight, the first new BR locomotives delivered in Rail Blue were AL6 electrics (later Class 86) E3101-E3200 and 'JB' electro-diesels (later Class 73/1) E6007-E6013. Delivery of these classes – both with small yellow warning panels – began in 1965. But what about the experimental XP64-liveried D1733? Where is that in the great scheme of things?

Entering service in 1964 to a fanfare of publicity, this otherwise standard Brush Type 4 (later Class 47) would remain the only blue-liveried BR diesel locomotive for more than two years, during which time new-build diesels of this class had continued to receive the familiar two-tone green. Beginning in November

1966, however, the Falcon Works at Loughborough produced D1953-D1961 in BR blue with full yellow ends, the final nine Class 47s from a fleet totalling 512 machines.

Older locomotives also began to be repainted in Rail Blue from late 1966 onwards, and simultaneously the final batch of BR/Sulzer Type 2s (later Class 25) D7660-D7677 was being completed in blue at Derby. They emerged early in 1967 while the last of the English Electric Type 1s, D8178-D8199 and D8300-D8327, followed soon after, also in blue from the start.

In October 1967 the first of what would later become the English Electric Class 50s, D400, entered service in blue, again with full yellow

ends – the first new diesel class exclusively delivered in blue livery.

In this feature I thought we'd look at some of the different blue liveries that were carried by BR traction during the steam era – TOPS and after is a story for another day and another pen. Inevitably there's a lot of controversy associated with the topic of livery, not helped by a host of 'alternative facts', that are bandied about, but I hope we can put our differences aside and consider instead the modelling possibilities that this fascinating transition era provides.



PAINT SHOP



REAL WORLD BLUES



An exception to the all-pervading green (or black) was made for the 25kV electric locomotives used on the Western Lines of the London Midland Region. They were painted in a bright Electric Blue livery with white cab roofs and red buffer beams. In September 1965 AL2 E3053 and AL3 E3099 stand at the west end of Liverpool Lime Street station displaying electric blue with small yellow warning panels.

As passenger engines, thought was given to applying Electric Blue to some of the Manchester-Sheffield EM2 Co-Cos, later designated Class 77. 27002 Aurora was the first, and it was joined by two more (including 27004 Juno), plus a handful of EM1s (TOPS Class 76), but the rest of the Woodhead route electrics remained in their dull BR green until they began to receive BR blue at the close of the 1960s. In 1968 27004 stands under the train shed at Manchester Piccadilly waiting to depart for Sheffield. Chris Davies/Railphotoprints.uk.



E3114 of class AL6 (class 86 under TOPS) was newly delivered from Doncaster when I photographed it at Longsight electric depot in October 1965. With this class the switch was made to the darker Rail Blue livery that would subsequently be standardised on all traction. The first five AL6s initially lacked warning panels and had red buffer beams, the remaining 95 had small yellow panels and blue buffer beams. Tim Shackleton.



RECREATING BRITISH RAILWAYS EARLY BLUE LIVERIES CONTINUES OVER.



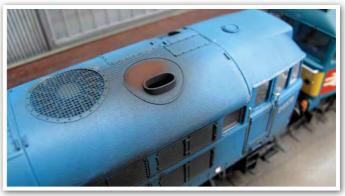
In June 1961 Brush Type 2 No D5578 was released into traffic in the same 'Electric Blue' carried by the first batch of LMR 25kV electrics. It later received yellow warning panels but was repainted standard green in 1964. This is a Lima body on a sawn-up Hornby chassis.



Unaccountably the otherwise excellent Lima body - though it has the correct exhaust ports for a Mirrleesengined locomotive as originally delivered features sealedup gangway doors. I retroengineered the front end with styrene door hinges and brass handrails.



D5578's livery quickly darkened, but I think Lima made a good job of capturing the original shade, offset by careful weathering. I mistrust the accuracy of many proprietary 'railway' paint colours but Revell No 50 Light Blue gloss was useful for touching-in. I must do something about the reporting numbers.

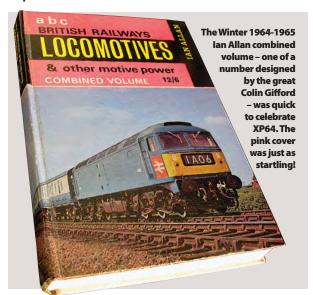


In 1962 Tri-ang released a 'OO' gauge model of the unique blue Brush Type 2. To the confusion of modellers ever since they gave it a white roof and bodyside stripes, but in reality D5578 was only ever in plain all-over blue (latterly with yellow warning panels) until it was repainted in standard green at Doncaster in September 1964. A hint of corrosion around the boiler port adds a touch of colour to the bodywork of my model.

RECREATING BRITISH RAILWAYS



In May 1964 D5578 was joined - briefly - by a blue Brush Type 4 that had been experimentally repainted as part of the XP64 project which, in turn, ushered in the Corporate Blue era on British Rail.





The attractive red flashes with the BR symbol were unique to this locomotive The received wisdom is that they were removed as soon as the first round of publicity photographs had been taken but this is not so - photographic evidence confirms that D1733 ran in traffic until at least mid-July 1964 with the emblems still in place. This is the Helian model.



The shade of blue used on D1733 was different to anything used before or subsequently. The engine also featured brown umber underframes (not dissimilar to the Pullman shade) that it was hoped would disguise the inevitable build-up of road dirt.

Now shorn of its red flashes. D1733 ran in everyday service in XP64 blue, the only blue Brush Type 4 ever to carry a small yellow warning panel. Having been hauled by this locomotive



to Wrexham on March 5 1967 - the date of the last steam express services on the Paddington-Birkenhead route - a model of D1733 was a must and I used a fiberglass burnishing brush to carefully remove the logos on one side only. This side has also received a little more weathering! This unique locomotive was repainted in standard BR blue in December 1969.



The first six electro-diesels of the Southern Region had been delivered in various shades of green but the remaining members of the class, all built at English Electric's Vulcan Foundry in Newton-le-Willows from 1965 onwards, carried blue with yellow warning panel - E6007-10 initially lacked BR emblems on the bodysides. E6007-E6013 were delivered with a grey band around the lower bodyside, but from E6014 onwards this was discontinued. These are heavily detailed Lima models.

EARLY BLUE LIVERIES CONTINUED...



Once the decision had been taken to fully implement the switch to blue livery, my observations at the time suggested BR was repainting its coaching stock a lot more quickly than its locomotives. D61 *Royal Army Ordnance Corps* was one of 22 'Peaks' that by June 1967 had been repainted blue, with small yellow panel, a short-lived livery variation that seems to have been unique to locomotives outshopped from Derby and Swindon.



Some say the relative lack of yellow on the cab front made the blue look brighter and more turquoise, even though it was just the standard Rail Blue. Others suggest it related to the undercoat used, or which manufacturer supplied the paint, or which workshop applied it. All I know is that – like the 'economy green' used on 'Britannia' Pacifics from 1965 onwards – it looked very different. I chose to paint what I saw at the time so I mixed Rail Blue 50:50 with LNER Garter Blue.



Starting in the summer of 1967, the final English Electric Type 1s were delivered in blue and it was quite a surprise to find them on York shed in the company of lines of stored BR lined black 'B1s' that they'd replaced on local freight workings. I repainted this pair of Bachmann locomotives to reflect their pristine condition on that memorable July evening.





Creating a MACON MACON DEPOTE

For a slightly different take on a railway depot scene, **MARK CHIVERS** builds Railway Laser Lines' recently introduced 4mm scale laser-cut Wagon Repair Depot.



AVING RECENTLY completed a longstanding 4mm scale laser-cut kit of a depot mess hut (Staff Projects, HM156), I felt the need for something a little more involved for my next project, which could also be incorporated into a depot scene at a later date. This is where Steve Smith of Railway Laser Lines came to the rescue, with his 4mm scale laser-cut Wagon Repair Depot (Cat No. RLL-101-WR).

This comprehensive kit builds into an impressive 285mm x 134mm x 80mm modern clad building reminiscent of the full-size structures you might see on today's railway. All parts are precision laser-cut using a combination of MDF, card and acetate which go together very well – I was impressed at

how everything slotted together with ease throughout the build.

The kit's structure consists of a section of hardstanding round which the four main sides build up. Interior supports and a detailed outer skin result in a sturdy and convincing building which is ready to plant on a layout or diorama. The hardstanding section can be fixed to the baseboard, while the building itself can be lifted off thanks to the supports acting as lugs that simply slot into locating holes in the base. This is particularly useful as it will allow me to further detail the interior with maintenance staff, equipment, tools and lighting at a later date.

The base has been designed for use with Peco code 75 or code 100 track, the shed is offered as a through road version or, as in

this case, a dead-end option. Having checked that all parts were present and correct, a quick read of the comprehensive PDF instruction manual (available via the website) is recommended.

The first stage is to offer up a length of 'OO' gauge track from beneath the hardstanding base - I used Peco code 75 flexible track - ensuring you allow enough rail to extend over and beyond the entrance lip so it can be connected to the layout/diorama once completed. This can then be held in place from below with masking tape. You will need to remove a few sleepers where the track passes over the base layer at the entrance – and also a few on the track on the layout side of the entrance. Such is the precision that Railway Laser Lines' Wagon Repair Depot looks at home in this diorama scene. Construction is straightforward and it is packed with neat detail.



each of the hardstanding overlays sits flush to the outer edges of the rails, as does the section that sits over the sleepers. I painted the hardstanding overlays using a spray can of Plasti-Kote satin warm grey, which was the closest colour I could find in store following easing of the lockdown restrictions, but other options are available. Once dry, the overlays were glued in place with PVA, ensuring the holes for the roof supports are aligned with those in the base sheet before the glue sets.

You will need to factor in painting and drying times throughout the build process as most parts will need to be primed/painted in advance of construction. Also, the instructions recommend masking any tabs/ lugs as the tolerances are incredibly fine and even the slightest amount

of paint may be the difference between parts slotting together or not. Care at this stage will save having to sand paint away later.

Construction of the outer skeleton is straightforward and further strengthened with the addition of the roof supports. It is worth doing a dry run of each stage before committing glue - and whilst development of the structure's basic skeleton was straightforward, I was a little concerned about the outer cladding layers as they are formed of a base layer and a very finely cut cladding overlay. However, my initial fears were happily overcome having attempted the first section for one end of the building. All that is required is a bead of glue around the outer edges of the base layer over which you then lay the cladding

section, making sure it is square and aligned throughout. Then, using slightly watered down PVA glue, sparingly (and gently) brush the liquid methodically over the section of cladding. You may find the card starts to bow slightly at this stage and you may need to gently coax it back to being flat. Once dry it is recommended that each section be stored under a pile of books or magazines to keep flat until you are ready to paint them. Again, once the paint is dry, keep these flat until you are ready to glue them to the skeleton structure. Incidentally, clothes pegs and offcuts of MDF are recommended to hold the outer layers in place without damaging the delicate cladding overlays.

For the final elements of the build, the corrugated roof sections

require a set of laser-cut window frames to be carefully glued within the apertures and then primed and painted ready for fitting over the roof cross-members. Again, you need to be careful at this stage as you also need to match up the window frames with the glazing sections beneath, while also ensuring the roof sections are square and equal. A dry run is essential before gluing in place.

For the final finishing touches, roof and end capping strips can be added to mask the joins in the roof, while a length of guttering is supplied for adding along each side. Since this kit was manufactured, a few amendments have been incorporated including clear laser-cut plasticard, which replaces the opaque acetate, together with

improvements in how the glazing fits within the roof, plus selfadhesive foil tape has been added to replace the paper end-capping, which can be painted over too.

And there you have it, a completed 4mm scale Wagon Repair Depot, which was a joy to be build. It features just enough complexity to keep the build interesting while ensuring the final structure was sturdy enough to be removed and replaced from its base.

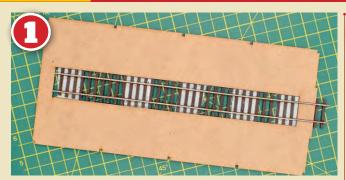
Thanks to the kit's easy-to-follow instructions and clever design we now have something a little different which is ideal as the basis of a standalone diorama or additional scene on a layout.

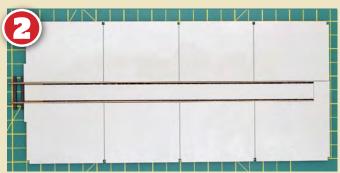

STEP BY STEP

BUILDING A WAGON REPAIR DEPOT



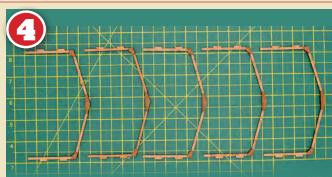
Having checked all the components are present and correct, we start with the base layer which features a cut-out for a length of Peco Code 75 track to be inserted from below. Fix in place with masking tape and remove the sleeper webbing where the track passes over the base layer at the depot entrance. Paint the inner edges of the rails within the base layer area (the outer edges and sleepers will be hidden by the hardstanding overlays).



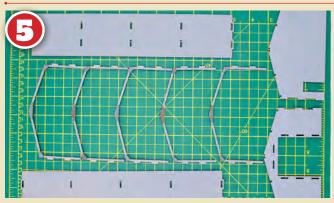
Paint the hardstanding 'concrete' base overlays which comprise three separate parts – two main base overlays and a central track strip. I chose Plasti-Kote warm grey aerosol as it was the closest colour I could find at the time. The two main base layers sit flush against the rail sides while the centre strip fits between the rails. Check it sits centrally between the rails to allow wheel clearance and glue in place with PVA.



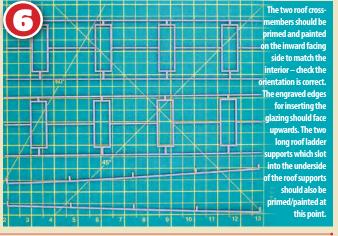
Add the top roof centre rivet panels and side top rivet panels to the roof supports. Of the five supports, two will only require these fitting to one side as the other will be facing against the skeleton framework. The remaining three supports will require rivet panels fitting to both sides. A useful jig is included to aid fitment.

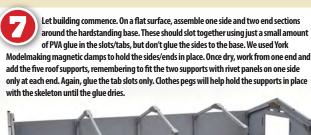


All five completed roof supports awaiting priming/painting. We used Halfords grey primer throughout the build for consistency and to aid photography. Finish in your chosen colour. To ensure a good fit, it is recommended that you mask the side tabs and bases of the supports during the painting process - otherwise you may have to sand down any paint overspray in these areas.



Dry runs are important throughout this build process. Take the four skeleton framework sections (two ends and two sides) and check fitment around the hardstanding base. Make a note of the interior panels and prime/paint these, leaving the outer fascias unpainted. Allow to dry.









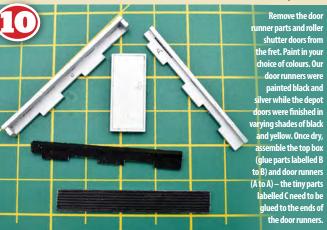
The roof support ladders can now be fitted to the underside of the roof supports. Gently push each lug into its respective hole beneath the rivet panels. These will give the structure added strength. The level of detail can be appreciated here.

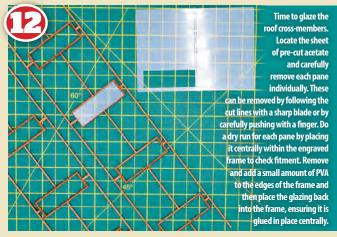


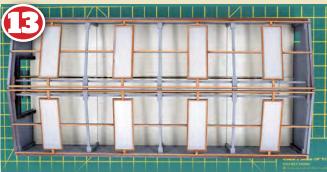




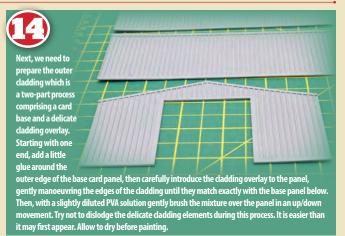


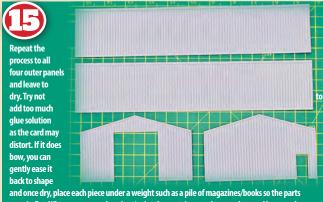
Assemble the door mechanism — first glue the side runners in place either side of the entrance, followed by the top box. Each part locates into the respective slots in the skeleton framework. You can then add your choice of roller shutter door. Don't glue it in place (unless you wish to). The doors can be held in position with a little Blu-Tak or similar.





Once all window frames have been completed, the whole assembly can be added to the roof. The cross-members should sit neatly within the recesses cut at each end of the skeleton framework and on the roof supports. Add glue to the recesses and where the cross members rest on the roof supports and secure in place.





and once dry, place each piece under a weight such as a pile of magazines/books so the parts remain flat. When you are ready, prime/paint the parts in your chosen colour and leave to dry. Again, place under the weight to keep flat.

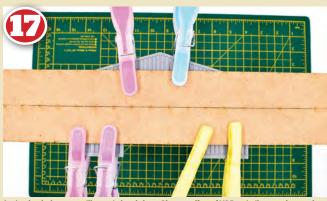


Prepare the skeleton framework for the outer dad panels. Apply glue to the skeleton framework and starting with the ends first, stick the panels in place one at a time and let each dry before attempting the next.

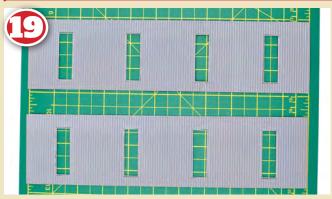

STEP BY STEP

BUILDING A WAGON REPAIR DEPOT



Again, the clothes pegs will come in handy here. Place an offcut of MDF or similar over the panel to protect the cladding and then hold in place with the pegs. Repeat for each panel until you have all four sides in place.



Once the glue is dry, prime/paint both sides of each roof section and allow to dry. Again, the card may distort slightly once paint has been applied. You should be able to gently straighten it out once the paint is dry and then place under the magazines/weight to keep the parts flat.

The depot building is now taking shape with all cladding panels in place and just the roof to be added. Check corner joints are flush—here you can see a slight gap in the bottom right-hand corner of the building. A heavier duty g-clamp (with an MDF offcut) was later used to overcome the issue. Next, do a quick dry run with each roof section and place over the roof cross-members to make sure the orientation of each section is correct and matches up at the apex, as well as over windows.





Add glue to the depot roofline and cross members, then make any final adjustments to the roof placement at the apex and over the sides. Offer up each roof section to the roof cross members and align the window apertures/frames over the glazing in the frames below. Double check the fit of the windows below and that the roof is sitting square. Leave to dry before adding capping strips.



Locate the corrugated roof sections and add the fine laser-cut window frames within the apertures in the roof. These need to be glued carefully in place and may need a easing into place with a cocktail stick or similar. Turn the cardboard sections face down and lower the frames into position. Repeat for each window.

Right: Wagons await attention in the yard outside the depot building. The building is constructed from laser cut MDF, paper and acetate parts.



Capping strips are provided for the finishing touch and to mask any joins. The capping strips on our kit were pre-printed and featured a score line. Gently bend them to shape ready for placement and add glue to the underside. Add the main capping strip length first over the roof apex, followed by the angled pieces at each end.



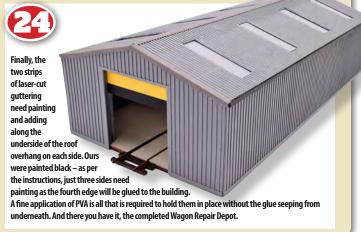

Again, check the alignment of the capping strips as you go, gently dabbing the material into place before the glue starts to set. The rear exit door was then added. This features on the door/door runner fret and is formed of two parts glued together back-to-back, painted and glued in place.

INDUSTRIAL COLORS

Canals moved goods and raw materials in large quantities across the UK even after the railways were built. **ANTHONY REEVES** shows how to create a canal side scene next to the industry it once served.



TOOLS

- » Craft knife/scalpel
- » Paintbrushes

Materials

- » 6mm MDF
- » Card/brick paper
- » PVA glue
- » Emulsion/acrylic paints
- »Scenic modelling materials
- » Varnish/resin

ANALS are easily incorporated into the model railway. In their simplest form they can be painted onto the baseboard and lined with vegetation growing right down to the water's edge. Here, however, the sides of the canal are created by simply gluing two 6mm sheets of MDF down to create a shallow channel which will hold the 'water'. Once the glue has dried, the bed of the canal is painted with a murky dark brown or black acrylic paint although this can be left until the end of the build.

Canals are edged with a huge variety of materials including brick, stone slabs, corrugated iron or occasionally cut directly out of rock. One side of this model has vertical corrugated iron sheets added to protect the sides of the canal from the barges and the other is edged with stone slabs. Corrugated card is glued to the edge of the MDF and painted and weathered to give a pleasing appearance. The other side is lined with strips of strawboard cut to scale 6ft lengths (24mm). A few holes are added to the edges of the towpath and short lengths of dowel are glued into them to act as mooring posts for the barges to be tied to.

A base coat of earth is glued to the tow path on either side of the canal, held in place with a coat of diluted PVA. Once the earth has dried, diluted PVA is painted running along the edges of the canal and a very fine scatter is lightly sprinkled over the glue. It doesn't matter at this stage if any scenic materials fall into the painted base.

A tall wall acts as a backdrop to the scene - this is simply a sheet of brick paper glued to a thick piece of card. The fence is constructed using thin strips of card which have been glued vertically to thin strips of plastic. To get the weathered look, the fence is painted white and then is heavily weathered using a mix of pigments and acrylic paints. The mooring posts are glued into holes running along the tow

path. These can be created using a bradawl or fine drill bit. 3D printed iron mooring posts are fixed in position on one side of the canal whilst wooden posts are used on the opposite side.

Although this is an industrial setting there is always room for a small tree, created in the standard way by twisting wires together to create the tree armature. The armature is then bent into shape and coated with bark. Canopy is teased over the tree and sprayed with hairspray. Mid-summer scatter is sprinkled over the canopy and fixed in place with diluted PVA, which is applied using an atomiser bottle.

Even in built up industrial areas, weeds will take hold growing around the walls, fences and around the base of buildings. To create a look of dead and dying grasses and weeds, raw grass fibres are chopped finely to create a very fine flock. Diluted PVA is painted along the fence, the edging stones and around the base of the crane and the fibres are carefully added using a wooden skewer. Fine pale green scatter is sparingly applied to parts of the glue to give a little contrast.

Detailing small scenes like this can be lots of fun and there is an almost unlimited amount of items that could be found stored or simply lying around in a scene such as this. Piles of coal litter the towpath as well as pieces of timber and general rubbish. Some of the earth tow path is toned down using black weathering powders to give it a grimier industrial look. A well-used and rusty barge is moored up awaiting reloading for another delivery.

The final thing to add is the water. This is created using a clear gloss varnish and is carefully applied using a soft paintbrush. Although it may seem preferable to have crystal clear water, often canal waters are far from it and can have all sorts of debris floating around on the surface. Some small leaves and twigs are carefully added to the varnish before it fully dries.

STEP BY STEP BUILDING AN INDUSTRIAL CANAL SCENE



To create the banks of the canal, two pieces of 9mm MDF are glued to the baseboard using PVA glue. This creates the channel which will hold the 'water'. The channel doesn't need to be particularly deep as the barges used will have completely flat keels.



The base of the channel can be painted with a dark coloured paint. The colour of the paint should represent the colour of the water so a dark murky green/brown is a good choice. Acrylic or emulsion paints are a good option. Multiple colours can also be used to add variation to the colour under the water.



Edging stones are added to one side of the canal walls whilst the other side is lined with corrugated iron sheets to protect it from the barges. Both the stones and corrugated iron are made from card and can be fixed to the sides of the canal with PVA glue.



Small holes are drilled into the canal bank and mooring posts are added. A mixture of narrow dowel and 3D printed mooring posts are used. The wooden posts often look more realistic when not 100% vertical.



The towpath is covered with diluted PVA and a good base coat of earth powder is sprinkled over the glue. A little weathered ballast and some fine twigs are sprinkled over the glue to add further texture.





A tall brick wall and fence are added to the rear of the scene. This fence is made by cutting thin strips of card which are glued vertically to horizontal strips of plastic. The fence has been painted and heavily weathered. A length of rusty corrugated iron sheet has been erected in front of the brick wall to protect it.



A small tree is added at the back of the scene. This tree is a wire armature covered with Treemendus bark powder and then given a canopy of foliage.

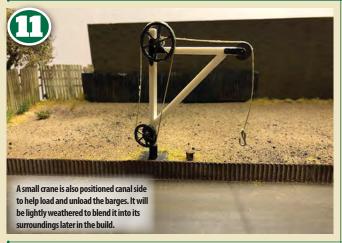

The finished scene. There are so many potential options for scenes like this. It could be filled with people working at the various canal side mills and yards, horses and carts or other vehides could be arriving and leaving the scene, while fishermen, walkers and such like will all add to the story.

The Orenstein and Koppel 0-4-0T passes the small halt in one of the return loops on the Rainbow Line.



HE NAME of the Rainbow line was given to my garden railway project by my granddaughter Chloe. She also made and painted the sign which adds charm to the layout. The railway is 1:24 scale, or 'G' scale as it is better known, and was constructed by myself during lockdown with the support of my wife Catriona, who makes really good cups of tea.

Peter Skinner, the owner of Chalk Gardn Rail in Kent, advised on, supplied and fitted the decoders and sound units to my LGB locomotives.

The layout is 60ft long and 2ft wide, with a return loop each end and a passing loop with two points positioned where the station stands. The buildings consist of a station, signalbox, church, goods depot, bridge and a signal positioned around the circuit.

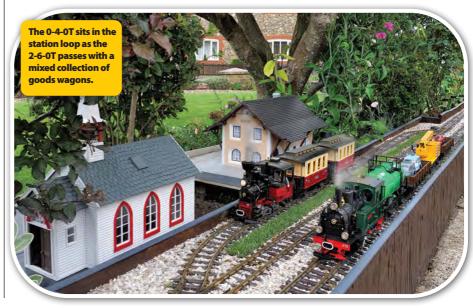
LOCKDOWN LAYOUT

When the lockdown was first announced, I decided to build a garden railway to keep myself busy. I have built several garden railways over the years, so it was

not so much of a challenge to get started. After some debating and planning it was agreed to build the railway at the front of our bungalow so passers-by could enjoy viewing the railway as much as ourselves. When concreting the basic support posts, most people looked on with some interest but no one questioned what I was doing.

Once the main structure was completed, and I started to lay the track, people got enthusiastic about seeing the railway completed. It took from mid-March until the end of May to get to the stage where I could run a train around the track. It was my intention to operate the railway on digital equipment but due to the lockdown, it was difficult to get my engines fitted with decoders and sound units, so I bought a small analogue LGB passenger set instead.

The locomotive from the set, which has sound effects, travelled around the layout first time perfectly. All the sections of the track were second-hand, so each section was cleaned and checked with adjoining clips tightened and lubricated. Everyone fell in love with the little train instantly, from small children to their grandparents. As a garden railway it has >>>

no theme other than its narrow-gauge track. I have added a few buildings but as our garden has matured across the season the railway looks great.

My granddaughter suggested that a rainbow is unusual to see and is quite spectacular to look at so it would be a fitting name for the railway. The garden railway is built substantially using fencing posts, decking boards and heavy mineral felt. Crushed oyster shell is used for ballast as it does not gain algae, it retains its colour and it drains well, which is very important to a garden railway.

RAILWAY MEMORIES

I am now in my 80s but my love for railways started when I was very young. I was born in a small village called Westoning in Bedfordshire 500 yards from the main Derby to St Pancras line which meant I could see, hear and smell the trains from my bedroom window. My first school in the village was even closer to the line so I could see the trains from my desk!

The first ever model engine I had was made for me by a German prisoner of war, who was working in the village installing a mains sewer pipe for the local council. It was carved from a single piece of wood, painted beautifully and had wheels on it from an old pushchair. I pulled this model along with a piece of string everywhere I went. I was five years old at the time but was already drawn to the railway! (I wish I had it now - it would be a real collector's piece.)

There was a lockdown going on at this time too, due to the war. There were no toys, sweets and no treats apart from what you could find in hedgerows. Food was rationed alongside fuel and there were no streetlights. At school we even had to have gas masks and bomb drills, but the railway made up for all of these deficiencies. We didn't need model railways at the time - we had the real thing!

We would watch the massive coal trains pulled by Beyer-Garratts up the steep incline between Ampthill tunnel and Sundown cement works. The fish, milk, livestock, mail and mixed traffic trains travelling to London would pass us with the engine crews waving to us and blowing their whistles.

We would walk the lines hunting for pieces of coal that fell off the overloaded coal trucks and ensured we were at the railway bridge when the fast-express trains came down from London. I

was lucky enough to see the very first diesel-electric engines 10000 and 10001 to be used in this country in 1948. These trains would blast their horns when they approached our school!

I consider myself as one of the original railway children and looking back I was so fortunate, even in those dark days, to have the railway. I hope that my rainbow line helps people forget the traumas and the sad times that this pandemic is bringing and provides them with enjoyment by being with the railway.

I think I have succeeded in the same way as Frank Hornby did by putting smiles on people's faces.

My next project is to build a perfect 1:3 scale signalbox to house the controlling equipment and to drink tea in with my beloved wife.

Barnetby to Wrawby

Barnetby in North Lincolnshire was known for its spectacular array of semaphore signals. **STEPHEN RICHARDS** explains how this 'N' gauge replica was built as a permanent exhibit at Immingham Museum.



MMINGHAM MUSEUM tells the story of Immingham. Upstairs we concentrate on the importance of railways to the development of Immingham Docks using the many transport related artifacts from the area and two large model railway layouts. Our 'OO' gauge model of Immingham Depot featured in HM155 and now it is the turn of our 'N' gauge model of the line between Barnetby and Wrawby Junction.

The original concept of this part of the museum was born from an idea in 2008 by John Trevitt, a railway enthusiast and modeller, and later a curator and trustee of Immingham Museum. In addition to the layouts and artifacts, the museum also has a library with a large collection of documents, which include photographs, articles, maps, working timetables and DVDs on display and all available for study.

We are also the proud hosts of the Great Central Railway Society national archive, which can be viewed by appointment.

The museum is accredited with charity status, so we have to meet a particular set of conditions and priorities, for both the displays and the model railways. For example, we want the models to be as historically accurate as possible, to be of interest and value to local historians and to be educational and informative to the wider public. It is important to the community that Immingham Museum is maintained as a successful visitor attraction and to this end, our volunteers and railway modellers are on hand with their experience to explain the exhibits.

Immingham Depot was the first to be built and when this model was completed we decided it would be appropriate to follow the historical setting with a modern day layout showing the busy freight route through Wrawby Junction and Barnetby, which feeds into the docks at Immingham. This location was also chosen because of its great interest to modern day rail enthusiasts who regularly visit the station to view the constant stream of freight traffic to and from the docks. Until 2015 it also possessed one of the most impressive displays of steam era semaphore signals remaining on the British railway network making it a great location for railway photography. Those have now been replaced by modern colour lights.

The Barnetby-Wrawby layout represents the period from the 1970s to 2015 and, as such, retains a mix of structures and trains throughout this period. For example, we felt it was essential to include the semaphore signals for which Wrawby Junction was famous. We are also adding Cleethorpes station which is at the end of the old





Great Central Line from Manchester.

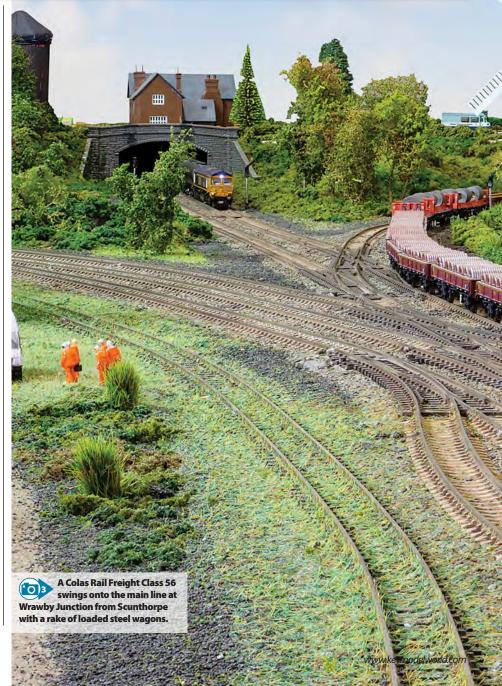
To achieve a near scale model of Barnetby to Wrawby within the space available (31ft) we had to opt for 'N' gauge, but even then, we are quite a bit short of the actual mile between milepost 94 at Wrawby Junction and milepost 95 at Barnetby East. The Cleethorpes section adds another 6ft giving a total of 37ft. Clearly, the model has to be robust enough to withstand the rigors of constant use and the steady stream of more than 2,000 visitors a year which means reliability is paramount. We also hope the model is of particular interest to railway enthusiasts and modellers alike and contributes to the historical background of the area.

FOUNDATIONS

When the museum moved to the present site, we were fortunate to be able to recycle a large amount of Dexion. This provides a very robust foundation to the permanent layout. The boards consist of standard household composite doors mounted on the Dexion. The doors are surfaced with a 3mm layer of rigid insulation foam. This provides a solid base for the track, but with some compliance from the foam layer. The only disadvantage of this type of construction is that access to the underside of the track is limited but given the age of the team this perhaps becomes an advantage!

Unusually we have no wiring under the boards, instead using copper tape to feed the track and point frogs. The storage yard at the rear is mounted on a wooden shelf 13in wide, again surfaced with rigid foam.

The track is Peco code 55, with nearly 500ft of it and 54 points. The track plan is a fairly accurate representation of the current railway between the east of Barnetby station and just west of Wrawby Junction within the space we have available. The layout represents just over a mile of actual track which would equate to 10.56m (34.65ft) in 'N' gauge, "

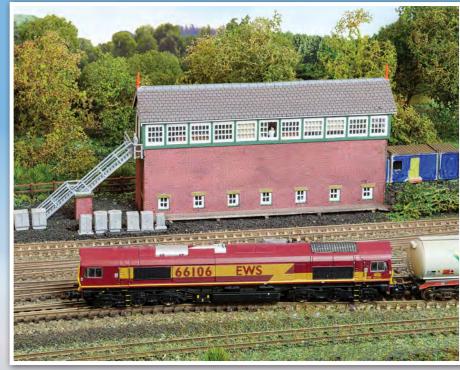


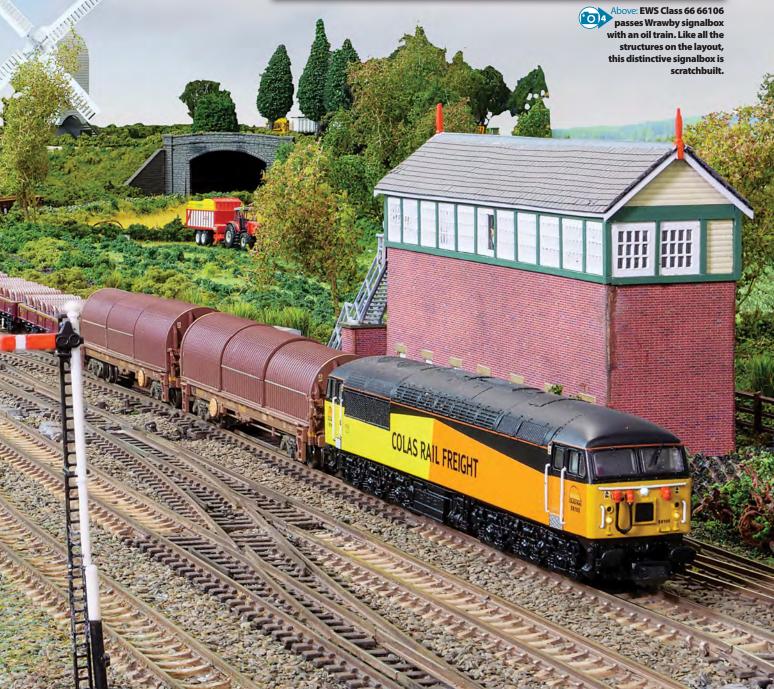
Immingham Museum and Heritage Centre

The Immingham Museum and Heritage Centre is usually open Tue, Wed, Fri and Sat afternoons (subject to current restrictions) and entry is free. The models and associated running costs are funded mainly by public and private donations and we hold an annual model railway exhibition on the third weekend in May each year in the Civic Centre (cancelled in 2020) where we have a variety of high-quality layouts.

The museum is located in the Civic Centre, next to the library on the corner of Pelham Road and Washdyke Lane, Immingham DN40 1QF and is served by the frequent No. 5 bus service from Grimsby. The nearest railway station is Habrough with hourly TransPennine Express and Northern Rail services.

so we are a little short of the actual.

However, although slightly short, all the key elements of the track layout are there, including redundant sidings on the north side and storage sidings on the south side. Fortunately, we have detailed track plans, so we have been able to replicate the current track plan as accurately as standard off the shelf point work allows.

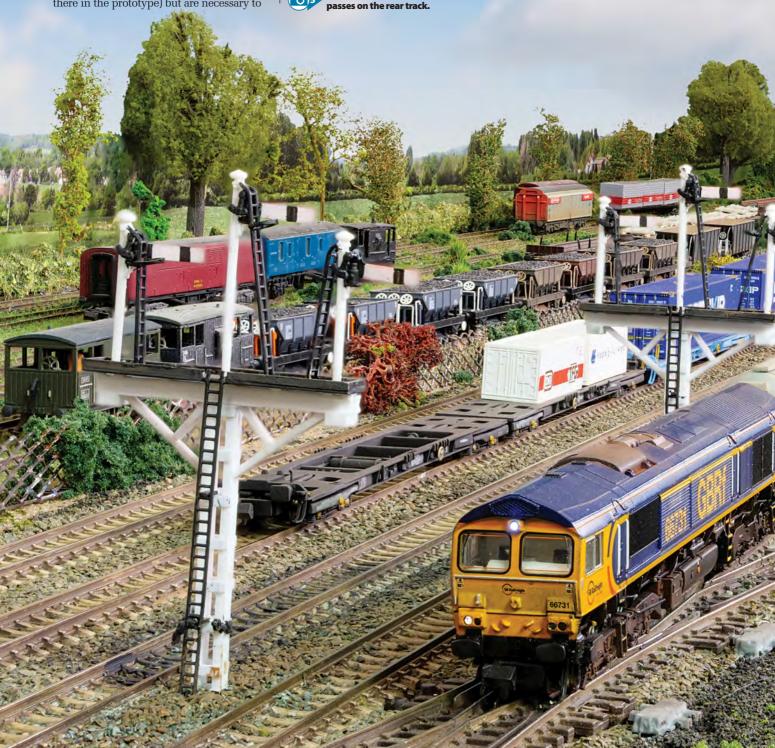
Wrawby Junction is modelled to include the three routes - south to Lincoln, west to the old Great Central Main Line to Sheffield and Manchester and north west to Scunthorpe and Doncaster. The layout includes crossovers and the ladder to the east of the junction.

Particular care was taken in laying the seven through lines between Barnetby and Wrawby to ensure that tracks were straight and parallel using straight edges and track spacers.

At each end of the layout the track disappears into tunnels (which are not there in the prototype) but are necessary to

hide minimum radius curves which feed the storage yard. These curves are hidden by rural scenes, including the Wrawby Post Mill, which represents the area to the west of Wrawby Junction. At the east end of the layout the curves are hidden by a representation of Humberside Airport.

The storage yard has 12 roads and although the area is essentially just a staging yard, backscenes are included to show country and industrial scenes found towards Scunthorpe. Tracks at the east end also connect into a future project of Cleethorpes terminus station, which provides passenger trains through Barnetby and Wrawby. All track in the scenic section is ballasted using standard diluted PVA techniques.

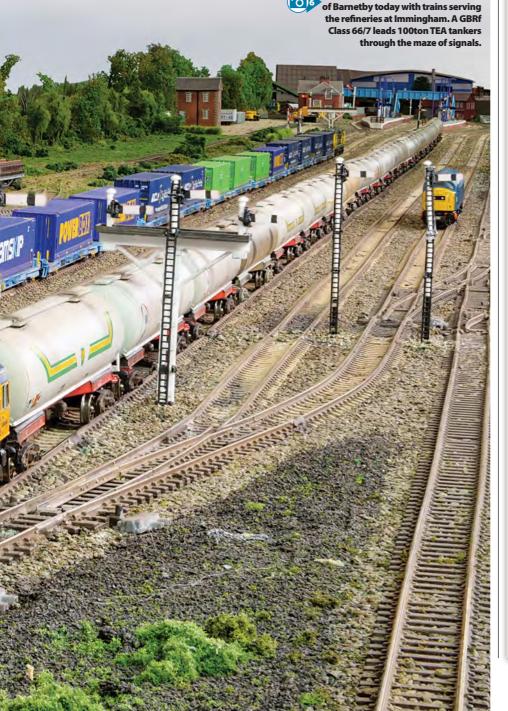
Control is by the Gaugemaster Prodigy DCC system using two controllers. All electrical feeds are through surface mounted 9mm 10amp copper tape, which in turn is fed by 10amp multistrand wire to minimise voltage drops. The layout is divided into eight sections to facilitate fault finding and has an additional switched section for the locomotive shed to minimise the overall load on the system.

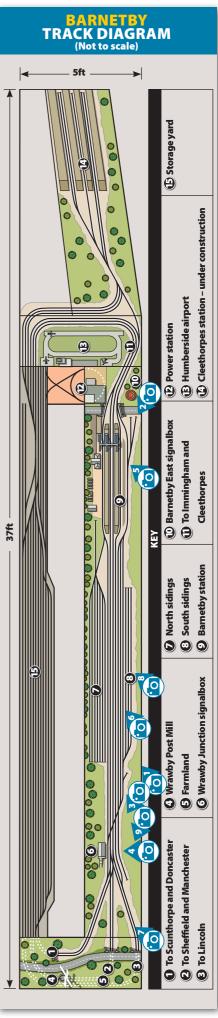
Point control is manual using the wire and tube system with the wires connected to electrical slider switches behind the backscene. The more complex point systems at each end of the layout have grouped slider switches which are numbered to match the track diagram mounted on the backscene. The slider switches away from the ends are aligned with the points, making identification obvious.

SETTING THE SCENE

Approaching the layout from the east, the first structure is Barnetby East signalbox, demolished in 2015. Also sited here is a representation of a coal fired power station. This does not exist in the real world but serves the purpose of showing visitors where most of the coal being imported into Immingham used to go. However, this traffic is in significant.

Block oil trains are a common feature









decline now, with the majority of coal now going to Scunthorpe steelworks to be converted into coke for steel making.

Moving east, the next structure is Barnetby station. This is shown as it is today with a significant part of the present station structure being the massive footbridge with its ramps for accessibility. The only remaining original station building is Stothard House which is accurately modelled and currently serves as Network Rail offices, still retaining the old ticket office and waiting room. Beyond this is an array of portable building style offices and containers in the maintenance yard.

As we move towards Wrawby Junction, the semaphore signals which existed prior to the installation of colour lights, are correctly modelled. On the north side are redundant sidings, which for many years in the 2000s had a selection of decaying scrapped bogie tank wagons which we have decided to show as one of the recent features of Wrawby. Next, we come to the 132-lever redundant Grade II listed Wrawby Junction signalbox. This is scratchbuilt to show the box in its current preserved form. The 'box has been redundant since 2015 with all of north Lincolnshire now under the control of York.

OPERATION

We have a selection of locomotives and rolling stock, which represent typical trains from the 1970s blue period, to present day Megafret container wagons. In total we currently run approximately 30 locomotives and more than a hundred wagons.

Freight is represented by iron ore trains to Scunthorpe steelworks, with wagons modelled from cut down Megabox wagons. The double-headed blue sound fitted Class 37s can often be seen on these trains together with Class 60s and 66s. Imported coal is represented with Freightliner liveried empties returning to Immingham.

Speedlink and Enterprise trains were a common feature at Barnetby and these can be seen together with an increasing number of container trains now the route is cleared for high cube containers for the growing container trade through Immingham. In addition there is the regular flow of bogie oil trains from the Immingham refineries.

Typical passenger trains from the 1970s onwards include Cleethorpes-London 'Deltics' and HSTs, blue Class 40s on the Manchester-Cleethorpes newspaper trains and blue Class 31s on the four-coach Cleethorpes to Newark Northgate. More recent passenger trains are an East Midlands Trains Class 156 running Grimsby-Lincoln and a 'Pacer' as used on the Saturday only Cleethorpes to Sheffield working along the old Great Central main line.

PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE

We have tried to represent the main features of the railway through Barnetby–Wrawby over the past 50 years to contribute to the historical scene represented here at Immingham Museum. The museum is about the past, present and the future of Immingham and the important role that the docks play in the country's economy. It is important to enable the next generation to be aware of the area's heritage and to take advantage of future employment opportunities.

Finally, it is important to note that the museum contains more than the model railway and docks exhibits. Downstairs, visitors can find out more about Immingham's social history, including its place in the story of the Pilgrim Fathers' voyage to America 400 years ago this year. We also have an extensive library of thousands of railway related photographs, maps, books, journals, magazines, sound recordings and more.

We are indebted to John Trevitt, John Tindall, Richard Laurence, Brian Bell, Gordon Luck and Ken Mallinson and Steve Richards for their support in building and maintaining the railway exhibits at the museum.

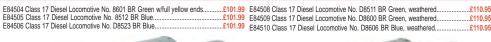

HE SOUTHERN REGION'S third rail Electric Multiple Units continue to be a popular subject amongst modellers, and the latest arrival for 'OO' gauge from Bachmann is the long-awaited model of the Class 414 2-HAP two-car unit.

Three batches were built between 1956 and 1963, with the first being to the Bulleid coach profile, Batches two and three were constructed to the BR Mk 1 carriage style and this is the type Bachmann has modelled in its new 'OO' gauge product.

Outwardly the 2-HAPs appeared near identical to the 2-EPB units with their family resemblance, but in detail they were quite different. For starters, the 2-HAPs had a lavatory

including the Class 411 4-CEPs.

Initially the 2-HAPS carried allover plain green, but this was revised in the early 1960s to feature a small yellow warning panel while in later life they also carried BR blue with full yellow ends, BR blue and grey and Network SouthEast colour schemes. The last was withdrawn in 1995.

Two have been preserved, with 4308 forming part of the National Collection on display at Locomotion in Shildon and 4311 based at Peak Rail in Derbyshire.

THE MODEL

Our sample unit models 6061 in BR green without yellow warning panels and consists of Driving Motor Brake Second Open

Trailer Composite Semi-Open Lavatory (DTCSOL) S75379 (Cat No. 31-390). In addition Bachmann is offering the 2-HAP as 6063 in BR blue and grey (31-391) and, with its later number, 4308 in Network SouthEast blue, white, red and grey (31-392). All three are due into stock across October and November with a retail price of £259.95.

Decoration of 6061 matched the high standard we expect from Bachmann and mimics the colour applied to the 2-EPB units closely. While the BR green colour scheme is quite plain on the face of it, there are plenty of small details to catch the eye including orange handrails

on the cab fronts, separately fitted multiple working cables picked out in black, data panel on the lower cab front, guard and load restrictions on the body side plus coach roundels, No Smoking signs, vehicle numbers and first class labels where appropriate.

The motor car carries an 18 route code (departure from Charing Cross on the South Eastern Section or from Waterloo on the Western Section) while the trailer car has two white blanks in the headcode >>>

panel. The panels illuminate in white or red depending on the direction of travel.

While appearing similar to the EPB stock, the HAP has a different arrangement of underframe parts which Bachmann has faithfully captured in model form. This extends to repositioning of the compressor, battery boxes and more while this updated chassis also includes manual switches for the headcode box and interior lighting. The same two-pin power coupling from the EPB model is used to transfer power to the trailer car from the motor car – the latter containing the 21-pin decoder which links to the main Printed Circuit Board (PCB) to control the unit's lighting functions.

The body tooling is all-new and models the shape of the BR Mk 1 based 2-HAPs superbly. Single piece handrails are provided at the guard and driver doors on each vehicle while the grab and door handles are neatly moulded – though you have to look really closely to spot this. The trailer car features the

lavatory at its centre with First Class compartments to the front and an open saloon at the rear with three plus two seating for Second Class. A further example of Bachmann's attention to detail is that the leading First Class compartment doesn't have a corridor wall – instead it is correctly open with a full width bench seat across the rear of the driving compartment bulkhead.

PERFORMANCE

Third-rail shoes

On the track our sample ran smoothly and quietly fresh from the box. It features the same style of mechanism employed in the 2-EPB and 4-CEP EMUs consisting of a single motor bogie positioned in the guard's compartment providing drive to two axles. Electrical pick-up is via all wheels while the link between the two vehicles is via a two-pin solid bar – the same as used for the 4-CEP and 2-EPB units.

The single motor bogie provides more than enough power to haul the two-car train – we did add an extra pair of coaches behind to find that it can easily take a four-coach

load when required. The unit also ran happily through a range of points and crossings on our code 75 track layout without any issues and also negotiated second radius curves during testing.

Five-pole motor

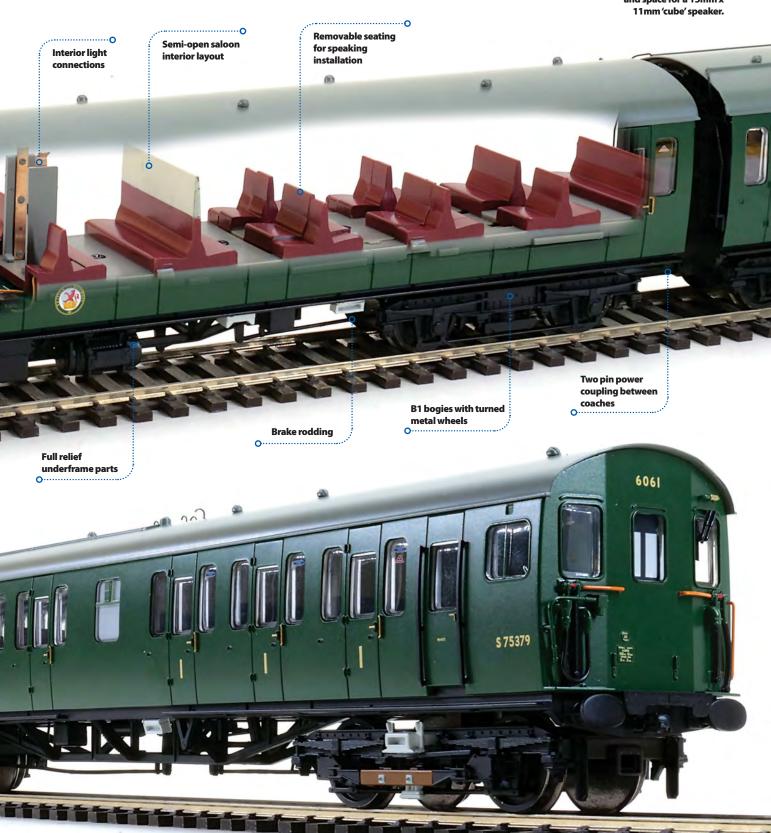
Inside the motor car, Bachmann has provided a 21-pin decoder

socket to power the train through Digital Command Control. As standard, all of the 2-HAPs are DCC ready – without a decoder plugged in – but it is a straightforward five-minute process to remove the body (although the body is a very tight fit over the chassis) and install

a suitable 21-pin chip. There is also space for a 15mm x 11mm cube speaker in the unit by removal of part of the seating unit, though there are probably alternative options within the saloon. On the plus side speaker connection tabs are provided together with a

rear enclosure for the cube, which means that no soldering is required to connect a speaker if you follow the route proposed by Bachmann.

OVERALL

It is really pleasing to see the 2-HAP arrive for 'OO' gauge as

it provides a useful expansion of the Southern Region BR EMU fleet which will help many layouts become more realistic in their operation. The HAPs are perfect partners to the 4-CEPs and also ran with 4-VEP stock in later life too. Overall, the 2-HAP is a great addition to the Bachmann portfolio and paves the way for the new 4-BEP which we hope will be available soon to join the CEP and EPB units of the past. An excellent addition which will extends SR EMU availability. (MW)

Prototype

FIRST REVIEW

In 1972 the prototype **REVIEW**High Speed Train (HST) arrived following construction at Crewe and Derby works.
Now Dapol has released its sought-after all-new'N' gauge model of this historic doyen of high speed rail travel in the UK.



HE PROTOTYPE HIGH Speed Train (HST) has a special place in railway history. It was the forerunner of the extraordinarily successful and long-lived production trains and entered service in 1972. Fortunately, one of the original power cars was saved for future generations by the National Railway Museum, and between 2014 and 2019 the father of the production HST was in service in preservation through a partnership between the NRM and the 125 Group.

In 2016 Dapol announced its plan to produce a ready-to-run 'N' gauge model of the prototype HST – and not just the power cars, but matching trailer coaches too. That product arrived during September with Dapol and is only available to purchase direct from the manufacturer. Pre-orders have already been supplied and, as Hornby Magazine closed for press towards the end of September, there was only very limited stock remaining at Dapol's HQ, such as been the popularity of the model on pre-order.

For more on the history of the prototype HST, see Reality Check on pages 74-77.

THE MODEL

Dapol's collection of prototype HST vehicles covers the two power cars as twin packs in original and departmental liveries, two packs of Mk 3 saloon cars in First and Second class liveries (with new tooling) plus a pair of Buffet carriages. The latter use Dapol's existing Mk 3 production coach tooling finished in the prototype livery.

The power and trailer cars look superb in their matching reverse BR blue and grey colour scheme. The power cars look their best in their service livery with smaller yellow ends in our view. Highlights of the model include detailed bogies, brake disc detail on the wheels, separately fitted handrails and buffers, clear glazing and wealth of underframe relief detail. Directional lighting is also fitted as standard while only one of each power car pair features a motor - though both have Next18 decoder sockets to power the lighting (and motor in the powered driving car).

Close inspection of the Mk 3 saloon carriages reveals their prototype details including buffers, recessed door handles, windows with bezels and no central door locking lights.

The complete collection of power cars and coaches allows a 10+2 formation to be created containing





four first class, two buffet and four standard class vehicles sandwiched between a pair of power cars.

PERFORMANCE

The prototype HST uses Dapol's latest super creep mechanism for 'N' gauge which offers superb quiet performance. The chassis also incorporates directional lighting and a Next18 decoder socket (their owner had already chipped our sample power cars) which provides a solid basis for both analogue and digital layout operation.

Access to the chassis is straightforward too – the body unclips from the chassis and can be lifted vertically, be careful you don't pull it away from the chassis too fast as wires link the lighting to the chassis.

All of the carriages are light bar ready with pick-ups factory installed on each bogie to allow for the addition of Dapol's lighting system. This is a straightforward two-step process to complete as the roof unclips from each vehicle giving direct access to the power socket to connect a light bar.

On the track, our sample proved to be smooth running and quiet through the speed range and offered ample capacity to move the full ten coaches and both power cars on Barrenthorpe, including tackling both the 1-in-68 and 1-in-30 gradients.

OVERALL

The prototype HST has such a significant place in the history of high speed rail travel in the UK - it was a revelation compared with the locomotive-hauled trains which preceded it in both comfort and speed. Dapol's new 'N' gauge model is a fitting tribute to 41001 and 41002 and is sure to be the pride of many a layout's fleet. (MW)

The High Speed Train has proved to be one of the icons of British railway history since its inception almost half a century ago.

EVAN GREEN-HUGHES

finds out how the concept was developed and looks back at the very first of the type.

ASSENGER traffic on the railways was, in the late 1960s, coming under extreme pressure from other modes of transport. New motorways and better road vehicles were taking business away from the short-haul routes while airlines were picking off the lucrative long-distance business traffic. The average speed of an express train was usually little over 60mph, and management realised that the only way customers could be retained was to offer quicker journey times, in vehicles that offered improved levels of comfort and ride.

It had been hoped that the solution to this problem would be the Advanced Passenger Train, with its very advanced and complex tilting mechanism but its development had become dogged with technical problems, resulting in the project falling further and further behind schedule and with some wondering if it would ever get off the ground at all.

By the autumn of 1970 it was becoming apparent that the original plan for the introduction of a fleet of APTs within a couple of years was unrealistic. As a result the British Railways Board authorised work to commence on what was then described as an 'interim' solution which would be to employ conventional rail engineering techniques to develop a high-powered express train capable of running in normal service speeds at up to 125mph on the current rail system with minimal modifications to the signalling or infrastructure. The brief was exceptionally optimistic - especially in that a prototype was sought within two years, with squadron service only three years after that!

A RADICAL SOLUTION

Experiments carried out showed that in order to meet the performance specification required the new train would need to have at least 4,500hp at its disposal, but this was considerably beyond what was available at that time if the resulting locomotive was

to be within the axle weights and overall size permitted by the civil engineers. The answer was to provide each train with two locomotives, one at each end, with the pair organised so they could be worked by a single driver. This would also have the advantage that shunting would be eliminated at terminus stations, meaning that each locomotive could do more than would otherwise be possible.

Crewe Works developed the power cars, as they were to become known, in conjunction with the Railway Technical Centre at Derby. Two were built with each powered by a Paxman Valenta engine, >>>



which was a high-revving design developed from the Ventura which had been tried in the Western Region's Class 14 0-6-0s and in the North British Class 29s.

To accommodate the increase in power, various features had to be strengthened and these included the crankcase and cylinder heads. This engine drove a Brush alternator which then powered Brush traction motors and from the outset the concept had to be carefully thought out as very intensive utilisation was proposed.

The styling of the new locomotives was very striking and was largely the work of Kenneth Grange, who had been given a brief to make the new trains attractive to the public. He decided that, as the locomotives would work in fixed formations most of the time, the 'train' end should be built to coach profile, making it blend in with the coaches and at the same time provide for a corridor connection to the main train. Each locomotive was provided with a driving cab at each end, but the 'train' end one was much smaller, while that at the leading end controversially was fitted with only one driving position in the centre.

A LUCKY DEVELOPMENT

Fortunately, a suitable design of coach was already under advanced development at Derby and therefore the prototypes for these, later known as the Mk 3s, were diverted to the project. These looked like lengthened versions of the existing Mk 2s but were in fact extensively redesigned, with the electrical equipment housed

under the body within an air-smoothed casing instead of being distributed all over the structure. There was a new design of bogie which incorporated air suspension and disc brakes which, in conjunction with anti-wheel slip technology, provided much better braking performance. Ten vehicles were initially provided and

these were fitted out in a number of differing styles to test public reaction.

Remarkably, the new train was ready for the rails in June 1972, but as with many things railway at the time, high speed testing was delayed for a whole year while union objections were overcome. The issue surrounded the working of trains above

100mph, for which the unions insisted on having two drivers present, and with the lack of side windows to the driving cab. The problem was that the power cars had only one central driving position and this was eventually to lead to a complete redesign of the cab to accommodate a second driver and insert side windows, which was incorporated into the production version - in the process making the trains even more attractive than they previously had been.

Once testing commenced it quickly became apparent that, unlike the APT, the High-Speed Train was going to work more or less straight out of the box. Some remarkable results were achieved in testing, including a top speed of 143mph on a run between Darlington and York but there were some complaints about smells coming from the disc brakes and about hunting from the bogies at speed. One or two issues with high brake wear on the locomotives and problems with the turbocharger had also to be dealt with. Most of these trials were carried out on the East Coast Main Line, but the unit then transferred to the Western Region where it was put into passenger use, initially covering the Paddington to Bristol and Weston-super-Mare routes.

Authorisation was quickly given for a production series of similar trains, with revisions to the power cars. By this time, the prototype train had become considered as a Diesel-Electric Multiple Unit (DEMU) designated Class 252 and this led to the coaches being renumbered from the coach series to the multiple unit series. However,

two of them were not being used within the HST and were instead refurbished to become part of the Royal Train.

After 18 months' passenger service with the Western Region, there were sufficient of the redesigned production HSTs available and the decision was taken to withdraw the Class 252. Both power cars were then sent to Derby where they were renumbered ADB975812-ADB975813 and used by the research department as part of the APT development programme. Three of the coaches became departmental vehicles while five more were upgraded and reused in new HST sets, where they received the numbers 41170-41174. Later two of the coaches became part of the Network Rail New Measurement Train.

By 1988 the Railway Technical Centre had no further work for the Class 252 power cars but by this time one of them had been claimed for the National Collection and 41001 was sent to York where it was cosmetically restored and put on exhibition in the Great Hall at the National Railway Museum. Unfortunately, 41002 was found to have no further future and it was scrapped in 1990.

A REMARKABLE RETURN

41001 remained on exhibition for many years but in 2011 it was assessed by members of the 125 Group and it was decided that it could be returned to working order. It was then taken to Neville Hill depot in Leeds where a replacement, but working, Paxman Valenta engine was fitted and extensive electrical and mechanical work was undertaken.

In May 2014 it moved under its own power for the first time in 30 years being later based at the Great Central Railway in Nottingham where it undertook public service, usually with a conventional diesel engine at the other end of a rake of coaches but sometimes on an HST set when one visited the line.

Controversially, the partnership between the National Railway Museum and the 125 Group was brought to an end in 2019, with the group later turning its attention to its two production power cars and coach fleet, and 41001 was returned to the National Collection. It is now based at the Locomotion site at Shildon where it is a static museum exhibit. No indication has been given as to whether it will ever run again.

BR'S GREATEST SUCCESS?

The prototype HST only had a short life in revenue-earning service, but it paved the way for the immensely successful production variant and proved conclusively that a very fast train could be built and operated using conventional railway technology and methods. It was a huge step forward at the time for BR.

While BR's preferred Advanced Passenger Train was a total flop which came and went within a very short space of time, the HST is still in service with us today more than 40 years since the first production trains entered service, which is a great testament to what was originally envisaged as a stopgap design. By the time the last is withdrawn from passenger service, it is likely it will have outlasted all of the great steam and diesel passenger locomotives – a remarkable achievement indeed.

Cavalex BBA bogie

AVALEX Models has delivered its second 'OO' gauge wagon project with the arrival of the

BBA 75tonne bogie steel wagons.

More than 500 of these 50ft long bogie steel-carrying wagons were built between 1973 and 1981 at BR's Ashford workshops for use on steel traffic in South Wales, the Midlands, North East and Scotland. Many were later converted to other steel carrying types such as BLA wagons with cradles for steel coil - a vehicle type that Cavalex Models has also produced in 4mm scale, exclusively for Rails of Sheffield.

Our review sample was finished as BBA 910075 in BR Railfreight red with black ends, representing a prototype built at BR's Ashford Works in 1974. A plain brown version with contemporary markings has also been produced for those who wish to weather their models to capture a present-day work-stained appearance. Rails of Sheffield has also commissioned a series of exclusive BBA and BLA triple-wagon packs from the manufacturer.

These wagons operated across the railway network.

On opening the box, you quickly become aware that this is more than just a standard wagon with its weighty diecast metal superstructure, sublime etched metal mesh decking and metal stanchions. A significant benefit to having metal stanchions is that they can be bent to represent the misshapen appearance of the prototypes. Look closer and there are separately fitted lamp irons, grab handles, sprung buffers, solid bogie handbrake wheels and a pair of outstanding FBT6 bogies with detailing visible from all angles including brake calipers, brake discs front and rear and more. There are also impressively fine pipe and cable runs along the underframe.

Decoration is also superb throughout, with a high-quality Railfreight black and red paint finish to the main superstructure and ends. Finishing touches include crisply executed Railfreight logos, TOPS panels, older style overhead live wire flashes and small lettering. Grab handles, lamp irons and solid handbrake wheels are picked out in white.

First announced in January 2018, Oxford Rail's all-new model features a level of finesse which is sure to prove popular thanks to a wealth of neatly moulded rivet detail, separately fitted blackened metal tank straps, blackened wire diagonal securing stays and an exquisitely moulded filler

cap and locking mechanism.
The impressive specification
also includes metal buffers and
a wealth of underframe detail
including handbrake levers, spoked
metal tyred wheels and more.

The tank barrel is refined and visibly slimmer than similar tankers offered by other manufacturers, daylight is also visible between the tank and underframe, while a metal weight is housed within the barrel which aids the model's running characteristics.

Decoration is evenly applied and topped by crisply printed Mobil logos, red bufferbeams, a single white star each side and legible solebar lettering, such as registration and builder's plates. Printing on the barrel also includes company

address and offset numbers.

To ensure the small tension lock couplings are set at the correct height, a revised style of coupler pocket has been developed which is part suspended from the underframe with a flexible centre section providing sufficient sideways play. Whilst on the face of it this works well, the coupler pocket and fishtail coupling appear shorter than standard NEM362 equivalents, which presents an issue if you wish to replace these tension locks with an alternative coupling type.

That said, clearly much work has gone into developing this super little wagon, which fills another gap for ready-to-run tank wagons and introduces further variety to fuel train formations. (MC)

ACHMANN'S enticing new 'N' gauge BR Mk 2f carriages touched down in the Hornby Magazine office during September.

The prototypes were introduced to service between 1973 and 1975 and whilst appearing similar in design outwardly, they included a number of improvements over their Mk 2d and Mk 2e predecessors such as full air-conditioning, new interior panelling and revised seating in Standard and First Class.

For review we received samples of Mk 2f Open First (FO) 3334 in InterCity (Executive) livery, rebuilt Mk 2f Buffet Open First (RFB) M1254 in BR blue and grey and converted Mk 2f Driving Brake Open Second (DBSO) SC9701 in BR blue and grey, as used on Edinburgh to Glasgow push-pull services.

As you would expect, these delightful new models are vast improvements over what has gone before for 'N' with a finely detailed body and underframe, tinted flush glazing, opaque lavatory windows, metal vestibule end handrails, neatly moulded window

boards, steps, gangway doors and impressive B4 bogies with steps.

Each captures the tumblehome of the prototypes well, together with the flush appearance of the underframe and plenty of separately fitted components such as representation of the large air conditioning fan on one side, motor alternator on the other and associated equipment cabinets. Underframe detailing is also different between vehicles - just look closely at the cabling on the DBSO's bogies - such is the attention to detail. In addition, the DBSO also features a detailed cab exterior at the brake van end of the carriage with representation of the mesh covered horns, working directional

Decoration is up to the high standard we've come to expect from Bachmann, with an evenly applied paint finish to each vehicle and crisp lettering, numbers, overhead live wire warning flashes and no smoking and first class window labels. Even the vestibule end lettering is legible.

Apart from its obvious end appearance, the Mk 2f DBSO also differs from the other releases in that it also features metal pick-ups to each bogie for the working directional head and tail lighting

and is fitted with a Next18 Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder socket for use with DCC systems. On test, the directional lights on our review sample worked as expected under analogue control, while they are also designed to be operated via the F0 button on a DCC handset.

Free-rolling metal wheels, Rapido couplings in NEM pockets and a small detailing pack containing pipework, ETH cables, deflector plate (DBSO only) and dummy coupling hooks complete these super new 'N' gauge additions to the Graham Farish range. (MC)

Weedspray train guises for 'OO'. Built at Coras Iompair Eireann's (CIE) Inchicore Works in the early 1970s, the prototypes have been synonymous with containerised freight services for decades as well as transportation of the distinctive Guinness beer kegs. In more recent times, examples have been repurposed for alternative uses including engineering and weedkilling duties.

For review we received examples of flat wagons 30072/30139 with caged beer kegs (Cat No. IRM1078-D), spoil carriers 30106/30131 (IRM-1073D) and the three-vehicle weedspray train's 30190/30286/30287 (IRM10180-WS).

Each pack utilises IRM's 42ft bogie flat wagons as the basis which features a diecast metal deck and underframe together with an impressive profusion of pipe runs, brake and underframe equipment, all of which are equally visible through the deck from above. A pair of neatly moulded Sambre et Meuse bogies certainly look the part, especially with their rotating axle hubs, although the separately moulded brake shoe detail looks a touch basic by comparison and is not in line with the wheels, as supplied. That said, they look fine from normal viewing angles and the wheels can, of course, be adjusted for 21mm gauge. Couplings are small tension locks in NEM pockets on a sprung

42ft bogie flat wagons with spoil containers.

> coupling cam arrangement, while a pair of close coupling bars is also included to replace these if you wish. Buffers are sprung plastic items.

As for the wagons' differing payloads, the beer keg liners are supplied with five individually numbered factory-fitted plastic keg cages with moulded keg loads per flat wagon. The brown cages locate securely to the flat wagon with spigots on the underside of the cages and the silver keg mouldings are easily removable - ideal for stacking in a yard scene and are also available separately too. Five different twin-packs have been produced, featuring individually numbered wagons and cages.

The spoil wagons feature two bright yellow 20ft low-sided open spoil containers per flat wagon. Each has debris deflectors at the outer ends while the central deflector section is a clip fit between the two inner ends, securing each container together. As with the keg cages, they feature spigots underneath which locate in corresponding holes on the flat wagon's deck. Again, five different packs have been produced, each with individually numbered wagons and containers.

For the piece-de-resistance, IRM has also produced the modern three-vehicle Weedspray train. Two wagons feature a pair of weedspray tank loads comprising plastic barrels on diecast bases. while the third is formed of a tank and a CIE 20ft container. Each tank is bright yellow, while the container is painted brown and carries chemical warning labels. Ladders and walkways are plastic, while the overall combination of metal bases and the diecast flat

Some parts are self-coloured plastic and would benefit from a little weathering, as per the prototypes, while neatly printed overhead live wire flashes, logos and CIE branding result in a superb, striking three-vehicle train.

Decoration is very good on each of the releases, with an evenlyapplied brown paint finish to the flat wagons, together with red handbrake wheels, lamp irons, blue bogie springs (departmental examples) and crisply printed small details, while the colourful payloads are equally striking from the neatly painted keg loads to the low-sided spoil containers and eyecatching vegetation control train.

For the finishing touch, a small parts pack is also included which contains close-coupling bars, spare rotating axle hubs, vacuum pipes and container security

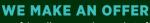

The LNER articulated 'Quad-Art' coaches stood out from the crowd – and the arrival of a new 3D printed resin kit from Isinglass Models was too tempting to resist.

MIKE WILD knuckles down to build a four-coach set for 'OO' gauge with a handful of modifications along the way.

HE LNER's articulated carriages have always fascinated me, both the main line corridor stock and its utilitarian suburban coaches. The 'Quad-Arts' were high on my hit list of models to build and when Isinglass Models launched its new 'OO' gauge kit for the stock, it was an opportunity too good to miss.

Two types are currently available from Isinglass which model the diagram 476 Composite 'Quad-

Art'and the diagram 467 all third 'Quad-Art' to allow a full eight coach formation to be assembled. The kit comprises 3D printed resin components for the bodies - two sides, two ends, roof and floor - plus a set of 3D printed bogies and a full set of interior seating and partitions.

To complete the coaches, additional parts are needed to assemble LNER turnbuckle underframes, and you have to source wheels and provide detail parts such as door handles and grab handles for each vehicle. We used three sources for these with parts being drawn from Dart Castings, Wizard Models and H&A Models (see table), although at the time of the build we were unable to get a set of vacuum brake supports so these have been omitted from the completed set of

carriages for the time beingthey will be added later.The quality and fit of the

Isinglass 3D printed parts is superb and after cleaning up of printing pips the bodies go together very simply and quickly. The single piece 3D printed bogies are also quite remarkable and once painted really look the part.

In modelling terms, the 'Quad-Art' vehicles are something of a minefield. The first were introduced in 1921 with further batches built in 1923-1924 and another in 1925-1928. There were detail differences between each batch and during their long careers there were a number of modifications to the designs including upgrading from gas to electric lighting, removal of the toplight windows in the passenger compartments, removal of the carriage end steps and more.

In building this kit I've aimed as closely as possible to represent a diagram 467 all-Third set in the BR era. The main changes that I've made are removal of the toplight window frames to give full depth openings either side of the compartment doors and removal of the end steps (a tricky process which I wish I had compromised on). In addition, I've added battery boxes for lighting together with dynamos. Research also shows that the fastidious would want to

introduce the destination box in the guard's compartment side.

The finished set models the now preserved all-Third 'Quad-Art' from the North Norfolk Railway in its BR career. This set was built in 1924 to diagram 467 and was originally set 74 with vehicle numbers 48661-48664 when built by the LNER. In 1943 the vehicle numbers were changed to 86384-86387 and these have been used for the BR period model with E prefix and suffix letters for the Eastern Region. Creating the numbers required careful cutting up of a sheet of Fox Transfers BR Eastern Region carriage numbers to create the right series for the 'Quad-Art'.

While we have made a couple of small compromises on the details, the result is a fully built set of 'Quad-Arts' which, even though they have been challenging at times when it comes to the details, really look the part. In fact, the components supplied by Isinglass Models are first rate and the only real complication in this kit's construction has been assembling the underframes to fit the stock using the etched brass parts due to the need to vary their length to suit the individual sections of the four-car set.

Would I build another one? Having continued my research I realise

The LNER'Quad-Arts' saw most of their careers in the hands of Gresley'N2' 0-6-2Ts on the Great Northern line suburban workings, but in their final years they were also hauled by the 'Baby Deltic' Bo-Bo diesels. The finished 'Quad-Art' departs Topley Dale in the hands of one of the unreliable English Electric diesels.

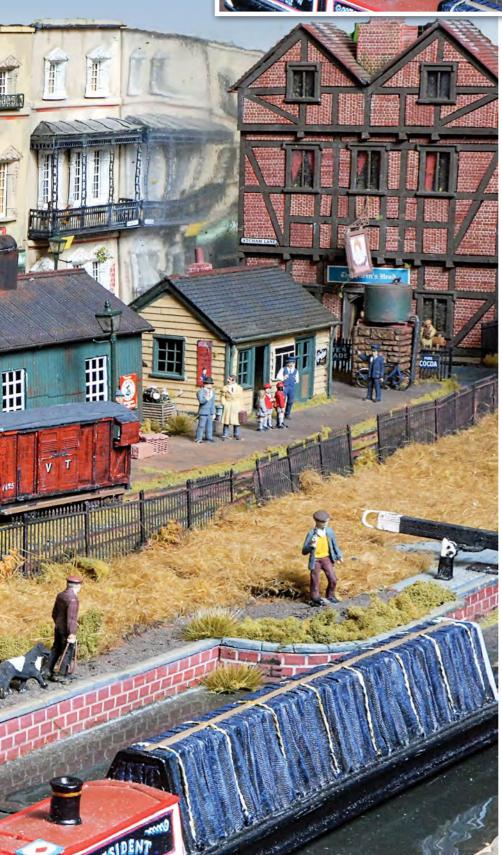
WHARF

Evoking the appeal of narrow gauge railways in an industrial setting, CHARLES INSLEY'S superb 'OO9' gauge layout captures the essence of a quintessentially West Midlands scene.

LONGSIDE narrow gauge railways, and modelling in 'OO9' gauge in particular, another of my interests is canals. I've long been fascinated by canals since a narrow boat holiday with friends after my A-levels, but between 2000 and 2004 I also had a professional interest in the canals of Northamptonshire as a historian, writing for the Victoria County History of Northamptonshire. It was inevitable, I suppose, that my next layout after Maesog (HM134) would have a canal on it. To add to the mix, over a number of years my dad and I had exhibited many of our layouts at the Stourbridge model railway show, which took place in the wonderful bonded warehouse $\mathbf{\hat{b}}\mathbf{u}\mathbf{i}\mathbf{l}\mathbf{d}\mathbf{i}\mathbf{n}\mathbf{g}$ on the Stourbridge arm of the Birmingham Canal Navigations. A model based on this building was to become the centrepiece of the new layout.

I wanted to continue the Welsh borders theme I'd developed with Maesog, so I decided to model the other end of the railway line, where the Vaenol Tramway (in theory) met the Shropshire Union Canal, and so Kinwardine Wharf was born. I also wanted to model something more urban than Maesog, and the eventual plan that emerged for Kinwardine had the railway tucked between the canal and the town.

Construction of the layout deviated somewhat from layouts I'd built before and since and makes extensive use of 5mm foam-cored sheet. There are two 20in x 30in boards with a well-braced frame made from 50mm x 25mm planed timber, with the top consisting of four layers of 5mm foamboard. The canal is the datum level and is the bottom two layers of foam board. The rest of the layout sits on the next two sheets. This has the advantage of being a light structure, ideal for exhibition use, but over the 16 years of the layout's existence I've noticed some issues of the foamboard warping at the edges. I suspect this may have been due to glue trapped between the layers not curing properly - the layout was built before I discovered that you should put some holes in the foamboard sheets if laminating them.>>>

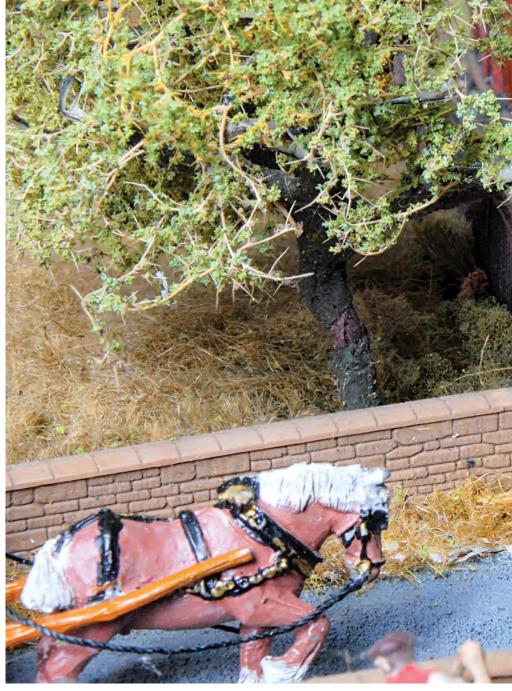

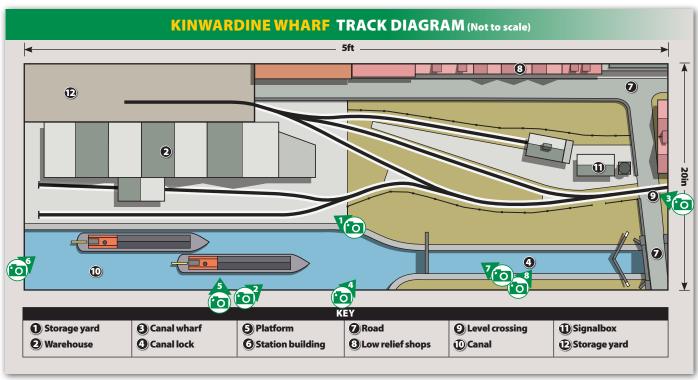
SIMPLE PLAN

The trackplan is simple but provides plenty of operational potential. There is a passing loop and a bay in the station which terminates in an engine shed, while two sidings form a kickback in front of the warehouse building, which in turn masks the storage yard area. Trackwork is Peco's excellent 'OO9' gauge product. Points are operated by wire in tube, connected to double pole, double throw switches which provide mechanical and electrical switching of the points. The track was then ballasted with the finest ballast I could find, using thinned PVA adhesive with a little washing-up liquid to reduce surface tension.

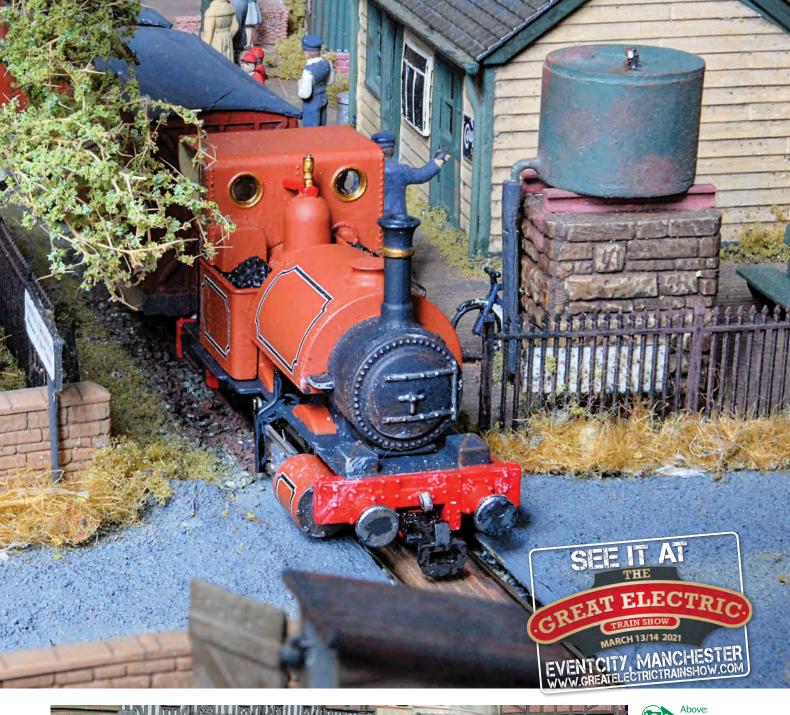
After the track had been painted and weathered, ready-to-plant clumps of grass and weeds bought from Greenscene were then added, especially at the end of the sidings to give the suggestion of a railway which, if not on the verge of collapse, had certainly seen better days. The trackwork along the quay in front of the warehouse is inset into stone setts from the Wills Scenic range. I did find I had to significantly chamfer the edges of the plastic sheets where they butted up to the track to reduce their height to below that of the rail tops. Were I doing this again, I would have made the track along the quay from rail soldered to copper-clad sleepers which would have allowed me to add check rails and made the area between the tracks look neater.

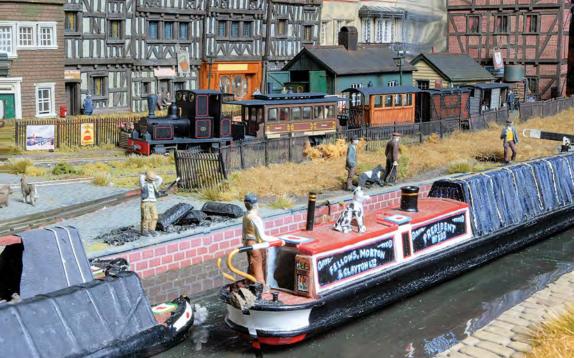
The 'off stage' storage yard is a series of cassettes made from 18mm x 18mm aluminium angle on plywood bases. These are standard across all my layouts (all six of them) and vary in length from four inches (just enough for a railcar) to 20in (enough for a Beyer-Garratt and three long bogie coaches – but that's another story). Alignment and current transfer is provided by small Bulldog clips that hold the cassettes in place and connect them to small pieces of the same aluminium angle which are in)

turn connected to the track. At exhibitions, there is a hinged drop-down shelf behind the layout, on which the cassettes and trains can be stored when not being used. This allows me to have six or seven different trains made up ready to use on the layout and involving a minimum of stock handling. Again, this is a system I've employed on all my exhibition layouts bar one.

URBAN BACKDROP

Unlike Maesog, which has a very rural feel, Kinwardine is a predominantly urban layout. The buildings are a mixture of scratchbuilt, by my late father, and kit-built. The warehouse is a substantial building built of a foam-core sheet shell, with Slaters English-bond brick sheet laid over the top. It is fully detailed inside and lit. The canal office next to the warehouse was also built by my father from Wills plastic sheet and fittings (windows, doors).

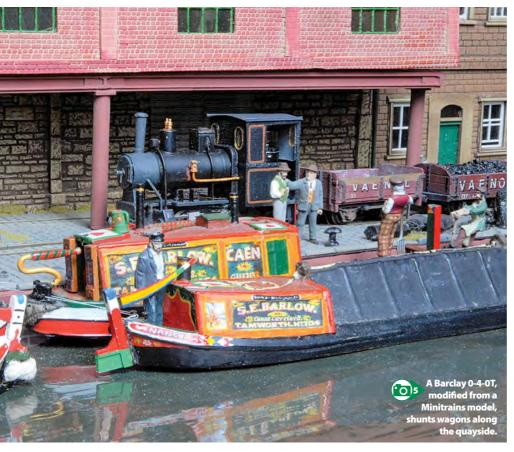
Of the remaining buildings, much of the row of shops that, in effect, form the backscene of the layout, was built from Langley 'Masterbuild' vacuum-formed shells, with etched and white metal fittings. The rest of the back row of buildings is scratchbuilt, as is the pub on the right-hand edge of the layout. The station building is a Wills kit, while the engine shed is a modified Wills 'tin tabernacle'. This has had its rather ecclesiastical windows replaced with plain designs from the Wills range, and has been raised up to sit on a brick plinth five courses deep. The various drystone walls on the layout are from the Hornby Skaledale range.

The main feature of the layout, other than the railway itself is, of course, the canal. The canal part of the layout features the wharf and a narrow lock (the 'Shroppie' was a narrow canal with locks 7ft wide). The water in the canal is many layers of yacht varnish over a coat of mucky greenbrown paint. The lock gates are from a Craftline kit, a mixture of balsa, stripwood and white metal fittings. The lock sides are Wills plastic sheet (plain bond brick).

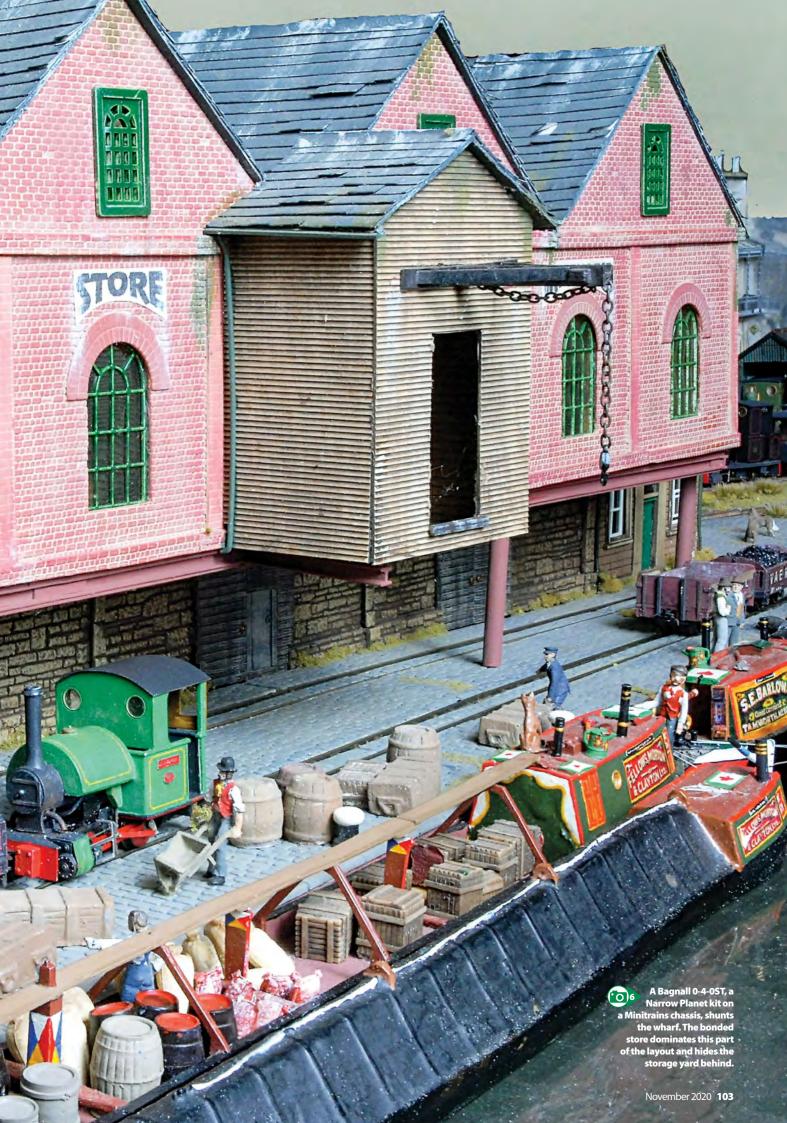
The other feature of the canal part of the layout is the narrowboats. These are a mixture of Langley kits, some cheap resin castings I picked up at the Loughborough show one year and a Hornby Skaledale steamer. All have been detailed and painted to represent real boats and the liveries are those that might have been seen in the West Midlands in the 1920s and 1930s. One of my little bugbears is that many modellers who include canals on their layouts are prepared to make the railway scene as accurate as possible, but happily overlook the canal. Indeed, the period of the layout is most closely set by the boats - the Skaledale steamer I repainted to represent the now preserved Fellows, Morton and Clayton steamer President, in its black and white livery, while there is a FMC 'pair' (motor and butty) moored up in the green and red livery which superseded the black and white in the mid-1920s.

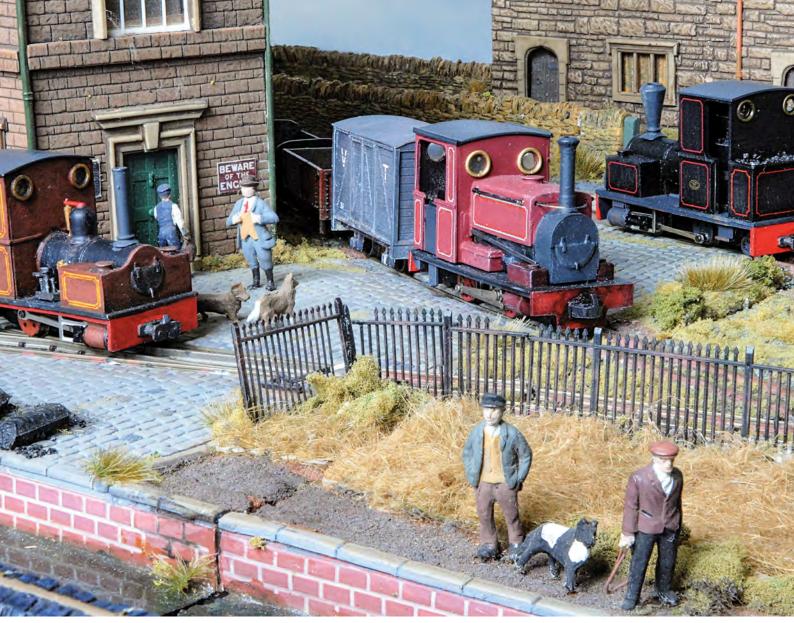
OPERATION

In terms of running the layout, I take the same approach as Maesog. There is no set sequence as such. I will tend to have six or seven trains made up and will run them in turn. At the very least, because the layout is a terminus, the locomotive needs to be run around its train. It may also need to call at the coaling stage (a grand term for a not very grand structure) by the engine









shed, and for water at the water tower.

Since the norm on most British narrow gauge railways was to run mixed trains, most of the trains I run will require shunting. The canal wharf gives a focus to much of the shunting, with goods being transhipped from canal to rail. Coal, for instance, is brought in and unloaded from the Barlow's pair and then transhipped into railway wagons. I generally find it takes well over an hour to run through a complete sequence of trains at an exhibition.

I am completely addicted to the building of trains - locomotives and rolling stock and really have far more than I need or can use at an exhibition! The recent blossoming of ready-to-run 'OO9' has been great, but the vast majority of my stock is still kit or scratchbuilt. A number of my more recent models are built using 3D-printed bodies which, beyond the available ready-to-run stock, provide an accessible way into 'OO9'. The layout has attended a lot of shows in its 16 years, including the Warley Show at the NEC in Birmingham and York, and has invites well into the future. It is due to be at the *Hornby Magazine* Great Electric Train Show in Manchester in March 2021. If you're there, come along for a natter.

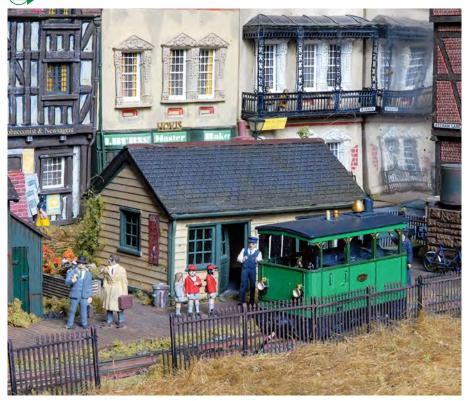
I've been a member of the 'OO9' Society for 36 years and can recommend it wholeheartedly to anyone interested in the scale.

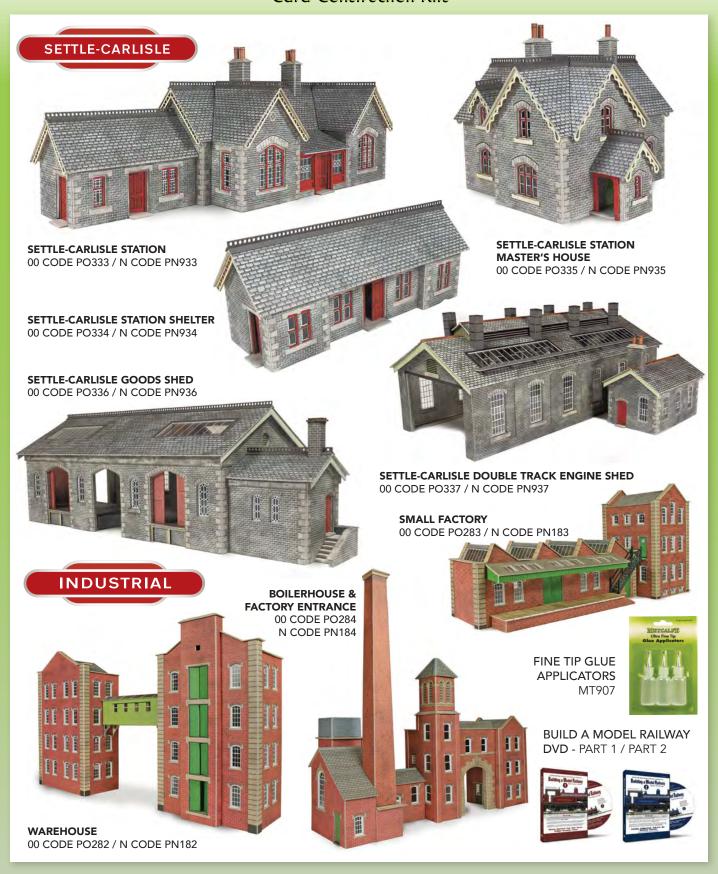

GRESLEY'S CLACE COACHES COACHES

Articulated coaches are often provided for the modern railway as a way of saving weight, improving capacity or for cost-effectiveness, but the idea is not new and first appeared in the UK almost a century ago. **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** takes a look at the famous 'Quad-Arts', which were amongst the most successful articulated vehicles ever to have operated in this country.



RAILWAY REALISM

F YOU TAKE A LOOK AT SOME of the new multiple unit trains being delivered to the Greater Anglia franchise at the moment you may notice something rather unusual. The new Class 745 and 755 fleet, which are built by Stadler, share the common theme of having adjacent coaches mounted on a common bogie, with the vehicles being articulated to one another, rather than coupled in the conventional way. This isn't the first time that this design feature has appeared in modern times, the ill-fated APT trainsets were articulated and almost all modern trams utilise this feature. Articulation is also a prominent feature of high-speed train design and is used extensively in trains such as those operated by Eurostar.

GRESLEY'S NEW BROOM

When Nigel Gresley was promoted to head the Great Northern Railway's (GNR) carriage department in 1905 he found that the railway possessed a motley collection of vehicles, many of vintage four and six-wheel design which were no longer really suitable for the traffic of



the day, being rough riding and lacking in passenger comfort. He soon put together a set of design features, including bow-ended coaches and improved interiors but he also proposed using the novel feature of having adjacent coaches articulated to each other.

To try this idea out he took two East Coast Joint Stock six-wheelers and had them mounted on a common 8ft wheelbase bogie, with this combination taking to the tracks in January 1907. There then followed a series of conversions of Great Northern sixwheelers and eight-wheelers, with the result that by 1915 there were 99 sets of 'twins', 13 three-car sets, 18 four-car sets and one five-car set, all using the articulated principle.

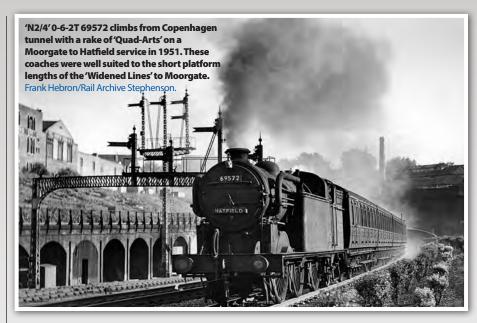
RAILWAY REALISM

With the idea of articulation proving to be satisfactory a proposal was put before the GNR board that two rakes of four-wheeled suburban stock should be replaced by trains made up of twin-articulated coaches. These duly appeared in 1911, having been built at Doncaster, with each set being only 330ft long, yet accommodating 623 passengers, and importantly, bearing in mind the limited power of the locomotives of the day, weighing in at only 147tons 4cwt. An interesting feature of these coaches was that the thickness of the partitions between compartments and the padding of the seats and seat backs was kept to the minimum to save space and weight. During 1913, three more sets were completed, along with some spare vehicle bodies. These sets proved the principle that articulation could provide more seats per train, while at the same time saving on build costs, and making the trains easier for the operating department to work.

After the ravages of the 1914-1918 First World War the railways set about renewing their run-down stock, and included in this programme was the rebuilding of the five eight-coach sets of 'twins' into ten eight-coach sets of 'Quads', which was achieved by providing 40 new coach bodies and also by remounting the vehicles into sets of four, providing four coach articulated sets, or 'Quad-Arts'.

As rebuilt these sets were very successful and lasted until 1954 on London suburban work, although they were sometimes also pressed into service on excursions to places such as Skegness, which must have been something of an endurance test!

From 1920 onwards the GNR began to re-equip its London area services with new eight-coach trains, made up of two 'Quad-Arts' each and there were several variations of design, mainly involving details such as guard's arrangements and door detail. By this time the heavier pattern of Gresley bogie was being used, as there had been issues with the lighter type fitted to the earlier vehicles, particularly regarding fractures.



In 1923 ten more articulated twins were built to the Great Northern design and these were found on the usual commuter routes and also worked to destinations as far afield as Cambridge. Similar twins were later provided for stopping services to Hitchin and Baldock, for Marylebone suburban services and for use in the Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire areas.

After the Grouping of 1923 construction of 'Quad-Art' articulated sets continued under the London and North Eastern Railway (LNER) with a series of all Third Class sets being built to a slightly revised design, which was to become a standard for future construction.

A new single bolster bogie was designed which was lighter than the previous type, but stronger and this enabled a four-coach set to be constructed for an overall weight of only 83 tons. Some of these sets were built by contractors, while others were built at Doncaster Works and amongst those contributing to the build programme were the Midland Carriage and Wagon Co, which built four sets in 1927. Eventually there were 97 sets in service.

COMMUTER REVOLUTION

The 'Quad-Arts' proved to be very successful, particularly on the GN route out of London, where trains often originated from Moorgate on the Metropolitan 'Widened Lines' and which was a section of railway which had short platforms. They carried millions of passengers each year in an efficient, if not comfortable, manner and their work remained relatively undisturbed until 1940 when some were displaced by electrification on the route to Finchley and Barnet. This resulted in four sets being transferred to Marylebone services, while during the Second World War one set was transferred to Hull. Some vehicles were damaged during air raids and this resulted in some reformations as good sets were made up out of what was left.

Often omitted from the 'Quad-Art' story are the seven sets that were built for Great Eastern services by York Works in 1929. These differed from the Doncaster vehicles in that two vehicles from each set, the Brake Third and the Third, used standard 51ft underframes which allowed enhanced facilities, but





these were regarded as secondary rakes rather than as purely suburban stock. Services out of Liverpool Street also 'benefitted' from 29 'Quint-Art' sets, which comprised five coaches and which were largely built by outside contractors.

The main fleet of 'Quad-Arts' continued in service until 1959 when a large number of Diesel Multiple Units were drafted in to cover suburban services, many of these displaced from East Anglia by closures and service withdrawals. Some 'Quad-Art' sets were taken out of service completely but others were refurbished, being given plastic laminate interior wall coverings and retained as cover for other types of coach. Others were retained in service for peak workings and were particularly appreciated by commuters who knew that they stood a better chance of a seat on these trains than in the semi-open saloons of the DMUs.

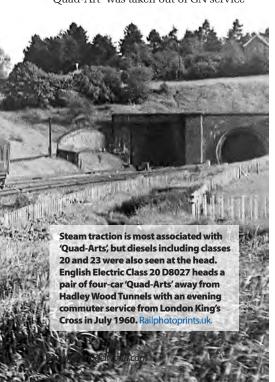
However, by 1964, it was apparent that the sets remaining were in very poor condition and as a result a number of standard BR Mk 1 suburban coaches were brought in to replace them. The last 'Quad-Art' was taken out of GN service on April 1 1966 but this was not quite it as three sets were then transferred to Sheffield where they were used to work summer special services until the end of the season. By this time the GE section 'Quads' had already gone, having been displaced by electric traction in 1960.

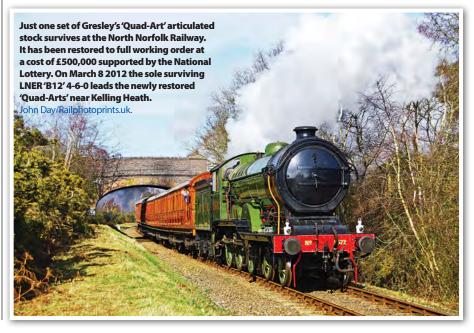
UNIQUE SURVIVOR

While that should have been the end of the story, we are fortunate that one set managed to survive. Set 74 was sent to A King and Co of Wymondham for scrapping in 1966 but was temporarily stored at Ashwelthorpe on the Wymondham-Forncett line which was by then just being used as a stock siding. A preservation attempt was launched and was successful and the set was then transferred to Sheringham on what was to become the North Norfolk Railway. There its condition was good enough for it to be used extensively during the line's early years as passenger stock and it remained on those duties until 1979, when it had to be taken out of service due to the poor condition of many of its doors.

Set 74 languished for many years in storage but in 2001 a comprehensive survey of its condition was undertaken which revealed that full restoration would come with a £500,000 price tag. Although fundraising began immediately and was successful, it was the contribution of £341,000 from the National Lottery which eventually enabled the full restoration of this unique set to proceed. A purpose-built storage shed was also provided as part of the scheme. The set is now in full public service, in its original teak livery, and enables us to experience just what it was like for commuters almost a century ago.

Nigel Gresley's use of articulation was a novel answer to the problem of moving huge numbers of commuters in an efficient way. The 'Quad-Arts' were neither comfortable nor prestigious but were a part of everyday life for more than 40 years. Many of the lessons that were learned from their construction have formed the foundation for the principles behind many of the modern trains that are being built today and for that reason if no other we should remember their place in the story of our railway history.

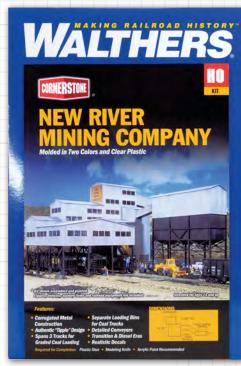
OMETIMES it takes me a little while to get projects on the move – and the quarry scene is a perfect example of that. I've been wanting to get started on the quarry for a long time as it is an important part of the Peak District setting in which Topley Dale is based. Think Great Rocks and Peak Forest and you will get the idea of what I'm working towards with the layout, though my trackplan will feature drastically shorter sidings than any real quarry loading point due to the limitations of the layout.

Nevertheless, even with its restricted siding length I should be able to create an attractive industrial setting which will be the perfect home for a rake of Hatton's ICI bogie hoppers when they aren't in use together with the growing collection of industrial locomotives on the roster.

Regular viewers of our Hornby Magazine Show on YouTube and visitors to KeyModelWorld might already have seen the first steps in this project which revolved around building a new section of

baseboard, creating the junction from the main line into the quarry and wiring all that track up for operation. That was completed in July and you can read an online only Staff Projects piece at keymodelworld.com/staff-projects explaining the process. Alternatively, check out youtube.com/hornbymag where our feature video from July 3 highlights the progress around the quarry baseboard and track.

Moving on from those first stages, I had acquired the buildings that I wanted to use for the quarry a long time ago - in fact they had been sat next to my office desk waiting to be built. I wanted a big building for the scene and for me the obvious choice was Walther's range of American outline plastic kits. They are made to 'HO' scale, but due to the large nature of American rolling stock and the buildings they create, the finished structures look perfectly at home on a British layout with careful kit selection. In the past we've used Walthers buildings for other layouts, including the station building on Grosvenor Square and the cement works on West Coast Cement, so I knew what to expect.



The New River Mining Company kit comprises a main rail loading **building** which will span three tracks, a separate tower for loading road vehicles and a conveyor route from one side.

The best bit about a Walthers kit is As plastic kits go, they are amongst the best - and within an hour of opening the box I had the basics of the main building complete offering

a six storey structure which would give the impact that I wanted. Contrary to the instructions, I didn't add the windows to the walls first as I wanted to spray paint the structure, so these were omitted for fitting after the full building had been completed and painted. This is a little more awkward to do due to restricted access to the upper levels, but worth the extra few minutes and twisting of my hand in exchange for a quick base painting process.

The rest of the build followed the instructions laid out by Walthers, but if you would like to see more of the intricacies of building the New River Mining Company buildings - and how we weathered them to look like a quarry structure - check out the free feature at keymodelworld. com/staff-projects which will be available from October 9.

Now that the main building is complete, I'm moving on to develop the scenery around it. You can watch how we went about doing that in the Great Electric Train Show special of the Hornby Magazine Show which goes live on youtube. com/hornbymag on Friday October 9 at 8pm. See you there! Etm

The IRDOT board fits beneath the baseboard with the infra red detector and emitter (black "tubes" shown in the right hand picture) fitting in a hole between the sleepers. The infra red beam is reflected from the underside of (unmodified) rolling stock.



When a train is detected the LED lights. It is easy to locate the LED on the control panel with 2 wires from the screw terminals on the left of the board. IRDOT boards are powered from 12 to 16 volts AC or DC. A range of IRDOTs with relays and switch off delays are also available. These may be used for train location, track isolation, operation of points, signals, lineside accessories, replacements for reed switches eliminating the necessity for magnets, interfacing to computers Infra red detection works in light or dark and requires no modifications to track or rolling stock.
