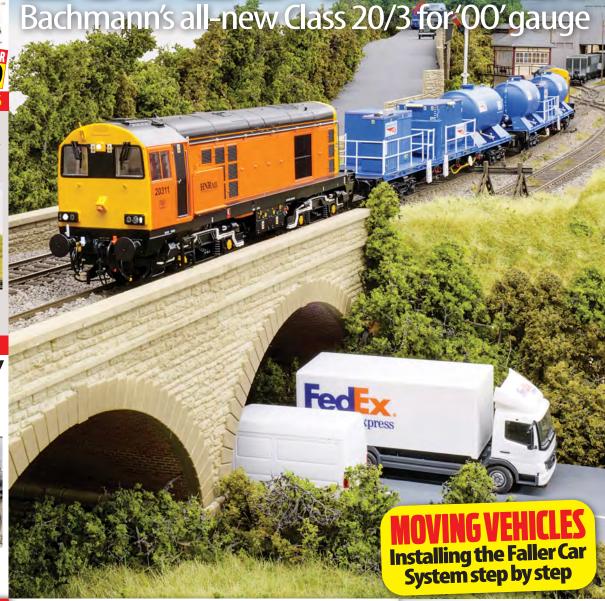

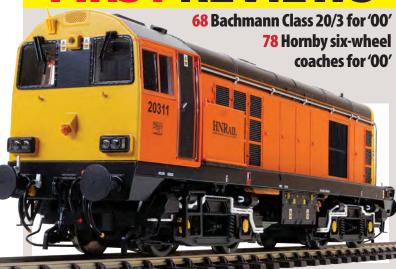

All-new'P2'and

N ALL-NEW'OO'GAUGE London and North Eastern Railway (LNER) 'P2'2-8-2 and BR'9F' 2-10-0 lead the way for Hornby's steam locomotive range in 2021, while partial new tooling sees improvements to the LNER'A1'/'A3' 4-6-2s and an expanding range of Hornby Dublo branded locomotives.

With the P2 Steam Locomotive Company's aspirations to build all-new'P2' 2-8-2 2007 Prince of Wales currently underway at its Darlington Works, Hornby is developing a brand-new model of this locomotive alongside. While the LNER'P2' 2-8-2 has been within Hornby's RailRoad range for a few years now, this latest model will feature fresh tooling and faithfully recreate 2007 Prince of Wales as it will appear when complete.

Expanding on the 'P2' collection, Hornby's tooling suite will also enable the company to accurately reflect original 'P2s' as well, with 2002 Earl Marischal in lined LNER green (R3984) planned while a streamlined example, as 2003 Lord President in LNER lined green (R3985), will be tooled for the first time too.

These all-new models will feature accurate dimensions according to prototype, fully detailed bodyshells, five-pole motor, an 8-pin Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder socket and much more. Priced at £209.99, the all-new 'P2s' are currently scheduled for delivery at the end of 2021. The previous version of the Gresley 2-8-2 will remain in the RailRoad range.

One of the 'stars' of Hornby's centenary celebrations in 2020 – 92220 Evening Star, the last all-new model to be produced under Tri-ang Hornby in 1971 - is to benefit from all-new tooling in 2021 as the manufacturer introduces a state-of-the-art model of BR's '9F' 2-10-0. Three new models are planned initially as 92167 in BR black with early crests (R3986), 92194 in BR black with late

Hornby is expanding its Hornby Dublo collection with a pair of airsmoothed 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s. These will feature the same mechanism as before, but with an all-new die-cast tooling for the locomotive body.

crests (R3987) and the National Collection's 92220 Evening Star in lined BR green with late crests (R3988), each with prototypical detail differences between them.

Hornby's tooling suite will include single and double chimneys, five new tender designs, representation of the coal pusher and more, while the specification also incorporates a five-pole motor, 8-pin DCC decoder socket, small tension lock couplings in NEM sockets and much more. Prices are set at £209.99 each, with delivery currently anticipated during October 2021.

Hornby is also planning to improve the tractive effort of its existing 'OO' gauge LNER'A1'/'A3' 4-6-2s with a newly tooled diecast metal footplate which will add more weight to the model and improve its overall appearance. In addition, Hornby is taking the opportunity to add firebox flicker to the popular LNER'Pacifics'.

Three new LNER'A1' models are planned as 2564 Knight of the Thistle in LNER lined green (R3989), 2547 Doncaster in LNER lined green (R3990) and 45 Lemburg in LNER black (R30087), together with the Railway Museum's LNER 'A3' 60103 Flying Scotsman in BR lined green with early crests and single chimney without smoke deflectors (R3991). Priced at £209.99 each, they are planned for release during September 2021.

Another highlight from last year's Hornby 100 range was the Hornby

Dublo inspired LMS 'Princess Coronation' 4-6-2 6231 Duchess of Atholl with a diecast metal body. Such was the success of this release, Hornby is planning to further develop the Hornby Dublo brand with three new locomotives added this year including a further LMS 'Princess Coronation' 4-6-2 46252 City of Leicester in BR lined green with early crests (R3918), together with two Bulleid air-smoothed 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s as 35016 Elders Fyffes in British Railways lined malachite green (R3970) and 35011 General Steam Navigation in BR lined green with early crests (R3971). As with the 'Princess Coronation, the new Hornby Dublo 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s will feature an all-new diecast metal body, while retaining a plastic bodied tender, and will utilise the current high-fidelity motorised chassis with 8-pin DCC decoder socket. Prices are set at £264.99 each, with the 'Princess Coronation' due for release during March 2021, while the Hornby Dublo 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2s are expected later during July. Just 500 of each will be issued. Hornby's popular'00' gauge

model of Stephenson's Rocket 0-2-2 gains a further release in 2021, as part of a special Royal Mail train pack containing first class carriage *Treasurer*, a third class open coach and an all-new Royal Mail carriage (R3956). The pack is priced at £199.99 and slated for release during September.

In addition, Hornby's range will be further expanded with 21 reliveried steam locomotives including additional LNER'W1' 4-6-4s, with 'Hush Hush' 10000 in original form with double blast pipe together with two further rebuilt examples in streamlined form, plus re-introduction of two BR'Clan' 4-6-2s, four new LBSCR'Terrier' 0-6-0Ts, two GWR'Large Prairie' 2-6-2Ts, two LMS 'Princess Royal'

4-6-2s, an air-smoothed Bulleid 'Merchant Navy', air-smoothed Bulleid 'West Country', a pair of Peckett 'B2' 0-6-0STs and more.

and Class 91 electric from the 2020 range, this year sees the addition of two new tooling projects with the introduction of the Ruston and Hornsby 88DS 0-4-0 diesel shunter and detail revisions to the Sentinel 0-4-0 diesel shunter.

Built during the 1940s and 1950s, the diminutive Ruston and Hornsby 88DS was suited to light shunting duties at industrial sites and was a step up from the smaller and lowered powered 48DS which was released in 2019 by Hornby. Hornby's all-new model of the 88DS will feature a three-pole skew-wound motor and six-pin Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder socket, with four models planned initially in North British Distillery Company (R3894), Rowntree and Company (R3895), BR lined green (R3896) and BR blue (R3897) colour schemes. Priced at £93.99 each, release is currently slated for July 2021.

Staying with the industrial theme, Hornby's 'OO' gauge Sentinel 0-4-0 receives a makeover for its release in Hitachi Rail livery, reflecting the prototype based at the company's Ashford depot which maintains Southeastern's fleet of Class 395 Javelin Electric Multiple Units (EMUs). New tooling has been developed to enable changes to

the front and rear grilles, handrails, air cleaner on the footplate, new (non-working) headlight, optional cosmetic Scharfenberg couplings, round buffers on the front and oval examples to the rear. Priced at £83.99, release is anticipated during November 2021.

Colourful contemporary liveries dominate the new release programme this year, spearheaded by the recently repainted Midland

Pullman liveried InterCity 125 High Speed Train (HST) set in Nanking blue and white. This eye-catching unit has been repainted by its new operator, Locomotive Services Limited. Hornby is releasing HST power cars M43046 and M43055 in a twin-pack (R30077), together with a full nine-car rake of matching Mk 3 vehicles – six Trailer First Opens, two Trailer First Restaurant Buffets and a Trailer Guard Standard.

The HST also appears in the original InterCity 125 livery it carried for LNER's Farewell Tour in late 2019, with power cars E43112 and W43006 (R3957), together with an accurate rake of blue and grey Mk 3s, while a First Great Western blue set is also planned with power cars 43098 and 43087 11 Explosive Ordnance Disposal Regiment Royal Logistics Corps (R3958) and matching Mk 3 trailers. Prices are set at £299.99 for LNER and GWR power car packs, while the Midland Pullman power car pack is priced at £314.99. Delivery of the LNER and GWR power car packs is expected during September, while the Midland Pullman power car pack is due by the end of the year.

Further vibrant colour schemes include Avanti West Coast's stunning Pride-liveried Class 390

Hornby's Co-Co Cavalcade returns for another year, this time comprising seven Class 66s in various DB Cargo UK, Freightliner, GB Railfreight and Colas Rail Freight liveries along with three Class 60s and two Class 56s (see Table 2 for full details). Hornby's Class 87 Bo-Bo electric also receives new liveries as 87006 City of Glasgow in its unique BR 'large logo' dark grey scheme (R30030) and 87009 City of Birmingham in BR InterCity

Carriages Galore



EADING THE WAY FOR Hornby's range of 'OO' gauge carriages and wagons for 2021 is a new series of fourwheel and six-wheel carriages in a wide choice of configurations and liveries - see Reviews, pages 78-79 and our competition on pages 14-15 for more on these new models.

The comprehensive tooling suite will enable multiple body and chassis configurations with eight different bodyshells across the range including four six-wheel first class, third class, composite and brake third variants, while the four-wheel options include first class, third class, brake third and a baggage brake. Whilst generic in nature, the vehicles feature plenty of detailing including separate running boards, separately fitted door handles, accurate roof vents for gas, oil or electric lighting, wheel profiles to reflect the prototypes and they will be offered with or without interior lighting too.

In total 45 individually numbered carriages are planned across the range and all except the four-wheel baggage brake vehicles will also be available fitted with Hornby's new magnetic lighting system – resulting in more than 80 vehicles in all. Powered by a CR3032 battery, the interior lighting system can be turned on and off with the use of a magnetic tool which can be waved over the carriage roof to

activate the onboard reed switch. Nine different colour schemes are being offered initially covering North British Railway (NBR), Southern Railway (SR), London North Eastern Railway (LNER) teak, BR crimson, London North Western Railway (LNWR), London Brighton and South Coast Railway (LBSCR), London and South Western Railway (LSWR), Great Western Railway (GWR) and Great Northern Railway (GNR) teak liveries (see Table 3 for more details). Prices are set at £29.99 for standard models and £35.99 for illuminated examples. Delivery is imminent with models expected to appear during January and February. The lighting system will also be available

Meanwhile, following the success of Hornby's all-new'OO' gauge Stephenson's *Rocket* 0-2-2 train packs last year and subsequent release of the Open Third vehicles, further vehicles will appear this year including a Liverpool and Manchester Railway (L&MR) Royal Mail coach, as part of a new train pack (see Table 1 on pages 8-9), while a triple-pack of new L&MR flat-bed wagons (R60014) is due imminently, priced at £69.99. A triple-pack of Open Third vehicles is also due during January (R40102).

separately, priced at £12.99.

At the other end of the era spectrum, to accompany last year's announcement of a new 'OO' gauge Class 91 Bo-Bo electric, new BR Mk 4 carriages are planned for



release in late 2021 with First Open, First Open with Accessible Toilet, Buffet/Kitchen, Open Standard and Open Standard with Accessible Toilet options, plus a new BR Mk 4 Driving Van Trailer (DVT). Liveries include BR InterCity, Great North Eastern Railway (GNER), London North Eastern Railway (LNER) and Transport for Wales (TfW) colour schemes (see Table 3).

Prices are set at £36.99 for the carriages and £69.99 for the DVTs. For those wishing to replicate the early years of electric operation on the East Coast Main Line, Hornby will also be releasing an unpowered buffer-fitted HST car for use as a DVT (R40162).

Southern modellers will gain an all-new Maunsell Dining Saloon in Third Class (Southern Railway) and Composite (BR) variants along with Maunsell bogie passenger luggage vans in SR green (R60020/A) and BR crimson (R60021/A). A Pullman liveried luggage van (R60057) is also being produced, representing the vehicle used in Sir Winston Churchill's funeral train in 1965. Prices are set at £49.99 for the dining saloons and £36.99 for the luggage vans.

Hornby's expanding range of BR Mk 1 carriages is to gain an additional vehicle type in the form of a newly-tooled Corridor Brake Composite (BCK). Five vehicles are planned in BR chocolate and cream (R40021), BR maroon (R40022), BR blue and grey (R40023), BR InterCity Charter (R40020) and Network Rail (R40024) liveries. Priced at £34.99, they are expected to be released during June 2021. Allied to these, Hornby's new BR Mk 1 Restaurant Buffet (RB) gains three further releases in BR green (R40025), BR maroon (R40026) and DRS plain blue (R40027).

Further modern-era liveries are planned across Hornby's range of BR Mk 3 carriages including BR blue and grey, First Great Western, LNER and Midland Pullman Nanking blue and white, to match High Speed Train power car packs in these colour schemes, while the Mk 3 sleeper carriages are also due to appear in BR blue and grey, InterCity and Caledonian Sleeper liveries, together with an interpretation of a BR Mk 2e Brake Unclassified Open (BUO) in the latter colour scheme. Also, five colourful Avanti West Coast Pride-liveried Class 390 Pendolino vehicles will be issued to further bolster the four-car train pack mentioned previously (see Table 2).

Hornby's 'OO' wagon range will be bolstered new liveries and identities on existing tooling including a series of HAA/HFA merry-go-round and CDA china clay hopper wagons individually and in triple wagon packs. Liveries include Railfreight red, Railfreight yellow and EWS liveries. There will also be a quartet of Beatles themed box vans. Further wagon releases include new private owner liveries on Hornby's latest four-wheel chassis. plus new identities for 12ton vent vans, 10ton quad vent meat van, oil and milk tank wagons and more.



The Beatles theme continues in 2021 with the addition of a quartet of collector edition wagons based around the group's famous albums.



The Hornby Mk 1 range is continuing to expand with addition of the Brake Composite Corridor which will be available in Western Region chocolate and cream as well as BR maroon, blue and grey and other colour schemes.

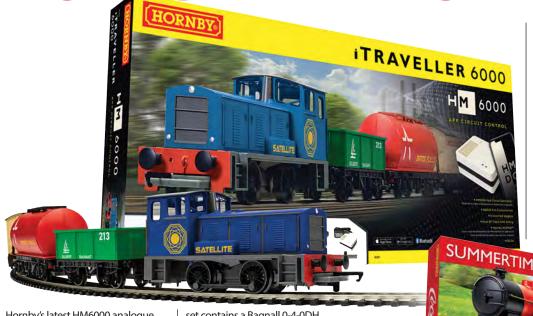

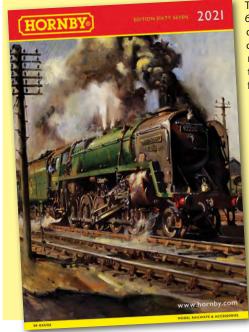

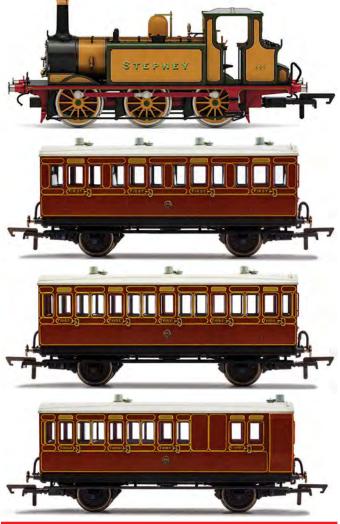

officially launched its UK division - Rapido Trains UK - with a series of newly tooled British-outline models including three 'OO' gauge projects, one 'N' gauge locomotive and more 1:76 scale double-decker buses. Leading the charge for 'OO' gauge is a Hawksworth designed '15XX' 0-6-0PT, with six different models planned. Whilst designed during the latter days of the Great Western Railway (GWR), the ten locomotives were built under British Railways' control at Swindon Works in 1949. Most were based at Old Oak Common depot in West London primarily for empty coaching stock moves to and from London Paddington and their short wheelbase offered a distinct advantage when negotiating tight track configurations. Their working

careers were quite short, with the first withdrawal occurring in 1959. Three were subsequently acquired by the National Coal Board for

at the Severn Valley Railway.

Rapido Trains' UK new 'OO' gauge model will feature die-cast metal construction, high quality motor, Next18 Digital Command Control (DCC) socket, sprung buffers and small tension lock couplings in NEM pockets. Factory-fitted digital sound options are also planned.

Six different identities are expected initially as 1506 in BR plain black without crests (Cat. No 904001), 1500 in BR plain black with early crests (904002), 1505 in BR lined black with early crests (904003), 1504 in BR plain black with late crests (904004), 1501 in BR lined black with early crest, as preserved (904005) and 1509 in National Coal Board (NCB) maroon (904006). Currently in the early stages of design, a price for the new '15XX' 0-6-0PT has yet to be confirmed. Delivery is anticipated in 2022.

With the popularity of industrial locomotives on the rise, the company's second 'OO' gauge locomotive project is the Hunslet 16in 0-6-0ST. Hunslet Engine Company of Leeds offered various 'standard' 0-6-0STs for industrial use including examples with 12in, 14in, 15in and 16in diameter cylinders. They were economical, easy to maintain and reliable. More than 40 16in 0-6-0STs were built by the company between 1923 and 1958 for use at various industrial concerns including collieries, mines and quarries.

Seven 'OO' gauge models are planned in a selection of liveries including 3716/1952 Alex in Oxfordshire Ironstone lined red (903001), 3782/1953 Arthur in Markham Main Colliery lined green (903002), 2705/1945 Beatrice in NCB lined red (903003), 3783/1953 Holly Bank No. 3 in NCB lined blue (903004), 1953/1939 Jacks Green in Naylor, Benzon and Co. lined green (903005), 3715/1952 Primrose No. 2 in NCB lined black (903006) and 3714/1951 Thorne No. 1 in plain green (903007).

The specification follows a similar pattern to the '15XX' with die-cast metal construction, high quality mechanism, Next18 DCC decoder

socket, sprung buffers and small tension lock couplings in NEM pockets. Plans also include factory-fitted digital sound models - a first for an industrial steam locomotive in 'OO'. Currently at the CAD drawing stage, prices have yet to be confirmed, although delivery is expected during late 2021.

Rapido Trains UK's third'OO' gauge model sees the resumption of the previously-announced (2017) Gunpowder Van (GPV) project.
A standardised GPV design was produced by the Railway Clearing House (RCH) in the 1930s, which was adopted by the GWR, LMS, LNER and Royal Ordnance factories, albeit with minor detail differences. These distinctive low-height metal vans were wood-lined to safeguard the potentially explosive cargo while being transported to military and industrial sites by rail.

Ten different 'OO' gauge GPVs are planned covering RCH designs, GWR and BR diagrams as Diagram 1/260 B887021 in BR bauxite (902001), M701508 in BR bauxite (902002), B887001 in BR grey (902003), Diagram Z4 105777 in GWR livery (902004), 105708 in GWR livery (902005), RCH pattern 701016 in LMS livery (902006), 299031 in LMS livery (902007), N260936 in LNER livery (902008), 147511 in LNER livery (902009) and 11 in Royal Ordnance factory livery (902010). Key detail differences will be incorporated such as bufferbeams,



doors, 'W' irons and brake gear. Rapido Trains UK's new 'OO' Gunpowder Van is at the design stage with a 3D test print of the wagon having been developed, ahead of progressing to the next stage of the process. Prices have yet to be confirmed, but delivery is currently slated for late 2021.

For 'N' gauge modellers, the manufacturer has unveiled plans to produce the Metropolitan Vickers Type 2 Co-Bo diesel. 20 of these characteristic locomotives were built at the company's Stockton-on-Tees factory in the late 1950s. Famed for their use on the 'Condor' Anglo-Scottish container services, the design was not as successful as anticipated, with troublesome mechanical issues and reduced route availability due to their unique axle configuration. Despite undergoing a rebuild in 1961, most had been withdrawn by the end of the decade. One was retained in departmental use until the mid 1980s.

Rapido Trains UK's new'N' gauge model will be offered in six different identities in post-1961 condition with flat windscreens. Models planned include D5709 in BR green (905001), D5711 in BR green with yellow warning panels (905002), D5713 in BR green with yellow warning panels (905003), D5707 in BR green with yellow ends (905004), D5705 in BR green with yellow warning panels (905005) and D5701 in BR blue with yellow ends (905006).

The specification includes separately fitted parts, high quality motor and mechanism, Next18 DCC decoder socket, directional lighting, NEM coupler pockets and digital sound options too. Design work is currently underway, with delivery anticipated in 2022. Prices have yet to be confirmed.

Finally, Rapido Trains UK is planning to expand its range of 1:76 scale buses with the addition of an all-new Leyland Fleetline doubledecker in West Midlands Passenger Transport Executive guise.

Originally designed by Daimler, the Leyland name was adopted for the Fleetline in the 1970s when part of British Leyland. A choice of 20 different registration numbers and destinations will be offered with the company's new 1:76 scale model, and detail differences to reflect original and rebuilt front headlamp and indicator arrangements will also be incorporated within the tooling suite.

Currently at the first Engineering Prototype stage, the new Leyland Fleetline will feature injection-moulded plastic and metal parts, accurate screwhead and rivet detail, body weld lines, etchedmetal interior grab poles, rubber tyres, steerable front wheels, flush glazing, working headlamps, interior illumination and more.

In addition, the manufacturer is also planning a new production run of its 1:76 scale 'New Look' Guy Arab Birmingham doubledeck buses. 11 new versions are planned with different registration numbers and destinations.

Prices are set at £54.95 per model, with delivery of both vehicle types anticipated during Spring/Summer 2021.

CCURASCALE has revealed the first engineering sample of its all-new'OO' gauge Class 37 modelling the first of the class - D6700. The manufacturer has received an array of tooling samples and bodies to allow it to assemble D6700, which celebrated its 60th anniversary in December 2020, while further samples are due to be revealed by the manufacturer illustrating the Class 37/4, 37/6 and 97301 variants which it is working on.

The all-new Class 37 was announced by Accurascale at the Warley Model Railway Show in

2019 and covers versions of the class which haven't previously been released in 'OO' gauge. The pre-production sample of D6700 illustrates the first five of the class which were built at English Electric's Vulcan Foundry between December 1960 and January 1961 which had subtle detail differences to the next batch including multi-part riveted cantrail grilles. Other features of the original Class 37/0 model include split-headcodes, front grilles, double riveted roof, bufferbeam cowling, large round Oleo buffers, bodyside water filler access door and steps and early bufferbeam pipework. The Class 37 sample is now

being reviewed for any tooling amendments and refinements which will be carried out prior to the decorated samples arriving in Spring 2021. Release of the model is expected in the

second quarter of 2021 with prices starting from £169.99 DCC ready and rising to £259.99 for a DCC sound fitted version.

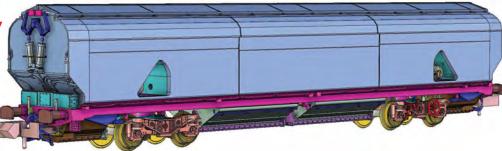

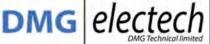

PAINT EASY THE HARDER WAY

Penmouth Curzon Street

Unable to decide on one location, MARK WILSON set out to create an 'OO' gauge layout covering London, Birmingham and the South West – to grand effect.

ENMOUTH AND CURZON Street was inspired by all my memories and goes back to my interest in railways from being a seven-year-old in 1977. All of a sudden, I came to understand that the trains that had been passing within 50 yards of my bedroom window on an embankment were actually all different sizes and shapes and had numbers on them. The line was the Midland Railway route from Birmingham to Leicester. As well as watching the trains, I started a number of layouts, but inspiration ran out before they were finished.

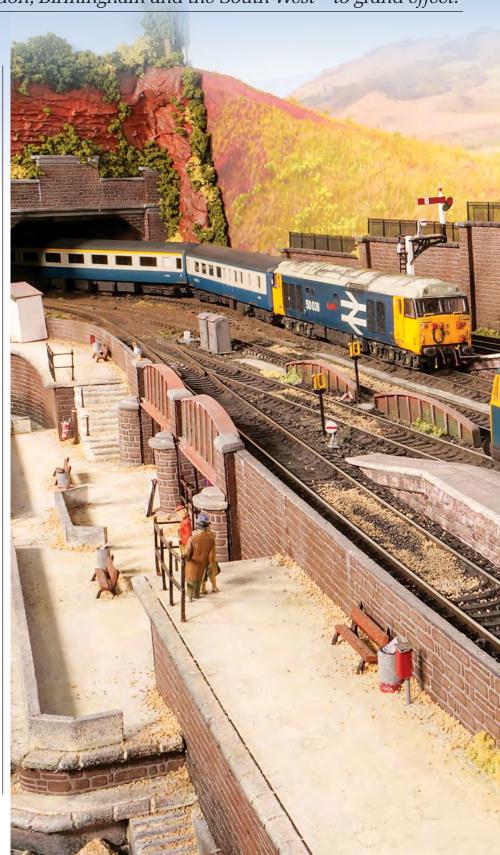
I have found out the hard way that my interest in many eras and locations was the problem. This has - after many years of searching and planning resulted in a multi-era, multi-location model that keeps me interested.

I wanted to run and represent train movements of the Midlands, London, Cornwall and Devon. Having spent many hours at Birmingham New Street, for me the most interesting and unusual workings were to and from the South West. To model this the layout is based in three locations spread across the country but also has trains from further afield. The first station is sited in the Birmingham area but has a few details that remind me of items from other stations. It has a parcel bridge that was semi-modelled on the structure at Bristol Temple Meads while the road bridge is modelled on the Manchester Victoria Corporation Street which I used to stare at waiting for Class 40s to pass under.

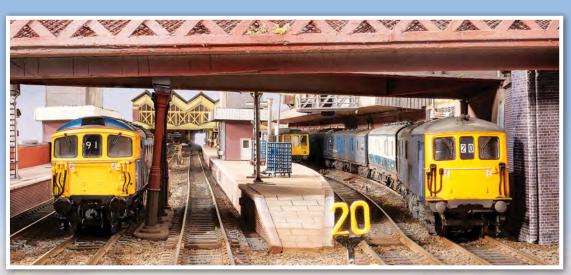
I have tried to create a station throat feel with a retaining wall to one side and what remains of a steam shed on its last legs but being used by the diesel crews more as a wind break. Above the retaining wall in a tight unusual space I have created a typical industrial area with a small garage and some warehouse buildings.

The middle section is modelled on London and the approaches into the capital with multiple routes crossing each other. I have tried to represent the essence of London at three different scenes across the width of the rear loop section.

It starts in the left-hand corner with a typical street scene framed by a disused >>>

railway bridge against the backdrop. One side of the road has a cinema and a department store housed in art deco style buildings. On the opposite side is a typical London Underground station with its towers, signage and overbridge. The tracks at high level represent the Underground and third-rail lines. The overbridge and the disused bridge above the road have mirrors at the rear to create a bit of depth to the scene.

The central section has high rise flats to the rear in quite a tight space behind the railway arches. This has a three-track main line with signal gantries to represent the approaches to the capital. Just poking above the viaduct is a little bit of greenery with the tops of trees.

The right-hand corner filler is a locomotive depot with the feeling of Finsbury Park. It is a six-road building with details including a fuel point, general stores and tanks. The retaining wall is made up of a mixture of brick finishes to give the feeling of different





periods where walls have been added to over time. Behind the wall is a more modern industrial building. The whole corner is actually just another storage area for locomotives when they are not required on the layout.

The final area of the layout is based in the South West around the Devon/Cornwall region, more the former, to be honest. Trains exit the middle section and enter through a divider screen that has a red cliff face and a tunnel portal based on Parsons Tunnel in Dawlish. I have modelled a small beach based on Dawlish with a railway overpass that

waits in the bay platform to the left.

leads down to the sea front. It has sea walls, railings, fishing boats, nets and scattered rocks at the base of the sea wall. I have also scratchbuilt a few brightly coloured beach huts to give the seaside feel with a few local seagulls lurking around for the odd chip or snack.

Another terminus building with an overall roof has the feel of Penzance about it - long platforms with semaphore signals perched at its extremities. Three tracks run into the main station roof area with a bay)

platform and two other tracks against the wall-side. This provides four platforms. The wall-side track ends at the Motorail platform end. This track stores coaching stock for the sleeper and Motorail trains.

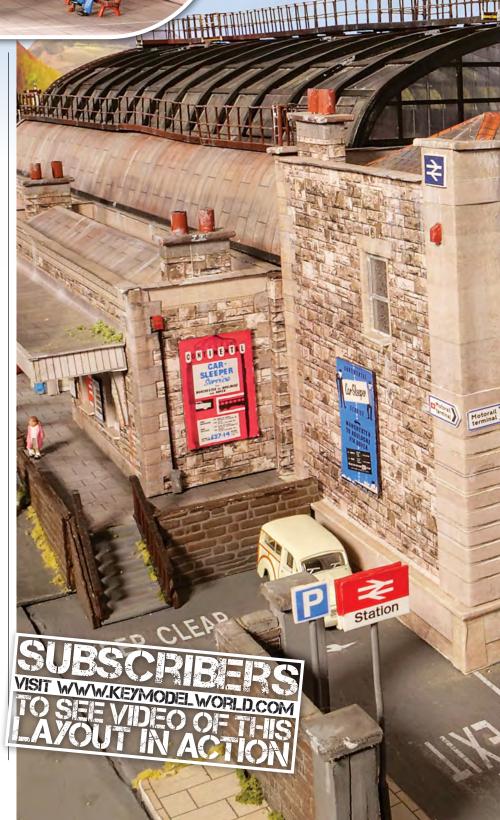
In front of the station building entrance is a vehicle turning area and taxi rank leading into the Motorail entrance. The Motorail booking-in shed and reception buildings are scratchbuilt based on a downsized version of those at Kensington Olympia. It also has a few sections of canopy and a small loading ramp with white picket style gates similar to those at Penzance from the 1960s to the 1980s.

THE LAYOUT

The baseboards are all 9mm MDF for the tops supported by a 44mm x 22mm softwood frame and support legs where needed. There are three baseboards. The one running under the stairwell for the run round loop is 8ft x 4ft with a 4ft x 2ft 6in cut-out in the centre to allow cleaning access to the tracks. The two station baseboards that run down either side of the garage wall are 18in wide and 12ft long. This gives an actual modelling area of 17 square feet with a total footprint measuring 16ft x 8ft. It's basically a 'U' shape with two 12ft side sections against the garage walls and an 8ft joining section. Off the joining section runs a loop under the overhanging stairwell.

Control is analogue, and construction is relatively straightforward - ballasting in the usual way with a PVA/water mix and track painted to look used. The challenges were to give a representation of the three areas so that on first glance other people seeing them would have a good guess at the locations. I think I have achieved this with Curzon Street resembling Birmingham Moor Street and setting the location in the West Midlands but firmly on the former Great Western. The London section is easy to identify due to the London Underground buildings, flats and complex track layout. The South West should be obvious with the pastiche of Dawlish!

The most unusual aspect of the layout is probably the Motorail terminal,

as I have rarely seen this side of the railway modelled. Looking into its history and the trains which ran, I only wish I could model more of this operation. Maybe a future layout devoted to a Motorail terminal could be on the cards for me one day?

I am probably proudest of Curzon Street station, which I scratchbuilt. All the early railways built things to last and had intricate details, which I had to model. I like the modification of kits such as the Peco overall roof at Penmouth station, which has been made wider and taller.

I made a point of building removable sections at the stations so that good camera angles have been created. It also enables very good views at platform height so it can be looked through at barrier/fence height to give the views I remember growing up. This is important to get the full feel of things.

Signals are all static Ratio models, but I also have some Knightwing colour light signals and old Dapol gantries with remodelled dummy signals. These are all removable and can be swapped out for other models depending on what period I am running.

OPERATION

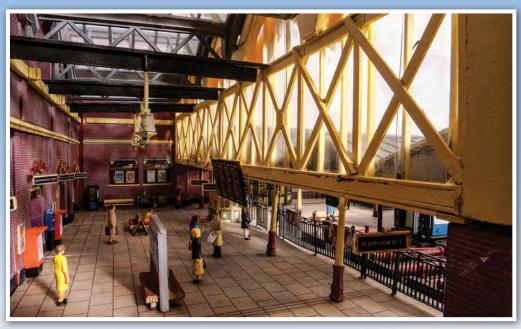
In terms of operation, my favourite models are probably my elderly but characterful Lima 'Warships' and 'Westerns', but I also really like the Bachmann sleeper and Motorail GUV coaching stock. I have three timetables which represent movements of trains in the three periods.

Traffic is formed of local, regional and long-distance trains plus parcels, perishables and when operating in early periods, milk and van traffic. Trains depart one station, do a few loops in the central London section and then head either to Curzon Street or Penmouth, depending on where they started from.

The layout can operate through three different specific time periods at the moment. These are 1968-1972, 1972–1976 >>>



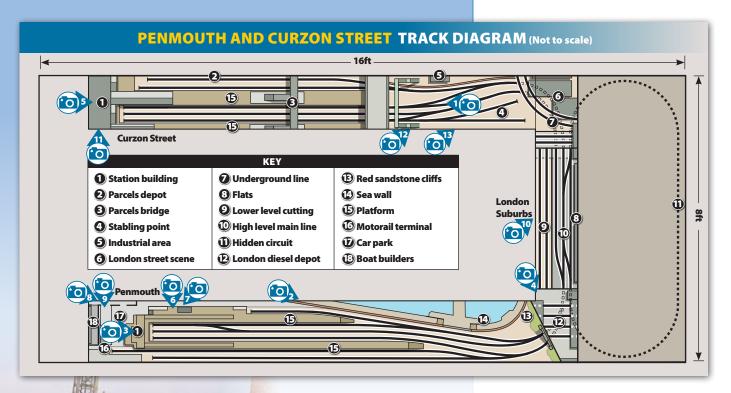




Left: The station forecourt at Curzon Street is packed full of detail and Mark has created removable panels to allow full viewing of its interior space.

Below: HSTs pass on the approach to Curzon Street while a Class 25 and 50 tick over at the servicing point.



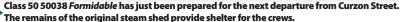


and 1977-1982. Each period has its own timetables and rolling stock changes that slowly blend into one another just as the real railway did. For this feature I focused on the 1977-1982 period. I change some of the buildings, vehicles, signals and so on to suit the running period. This allows me to transform maroon locomotives and coaching stock into the BR blue period ending in the popular 'large logo' livery. I am now in the process of adding two more periods – 1964-1968 allowing for the end of steam and the early green diesels with chocolate and cream Western Region coaching stock, and 1982-1986 for the beginning of Network SouthEast and InterCity 'Swallow' livery. For my next project, I have already

started a layout called Essence of Swindon Works, which is a small diorama project to display my diesel-hydraulic models and the occasional steam locomotive. They will shuttle in and out of the Works on an automated system and I will probably make the leap into DCC sound with this layout. It only measures 80cm x 40cm, but with the use of mirrors I hope to gain some apparent depth. The wall sections of the buildings will be removable for viewing and the periods will stretch from the 1950s to the closure of Swindon Works in 1985.

Penmouth and Curzon Street has taken a long time to come to fruition and a lot of work – but it gives me great enjoyment, and I hope *Hornby Magazine* readers appreciate it too.

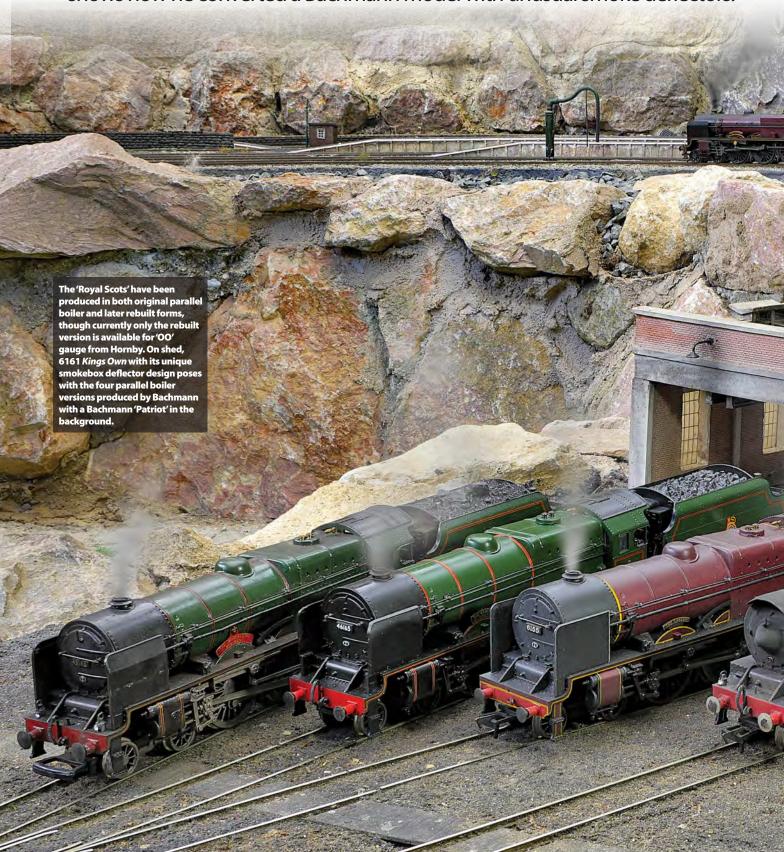

A'baseball cap'for a SCOT'

Sometimes, you want a model which is utterly unique, and as with many classes, the 'Royal Scots' had their fair share of modifications. **TREVOR JONES** shows how he converted a Bachmann model with unusual smoke deflectors.



WORK BENCH

VERTHE YEARS SEVERAL classes of locomotive have had experimental smokeboxes, chimneys, ACFI feed water heaters and smoke deflector designs which have radically altered their appearance. Amongst those, the LMS 'Royal Scots' stand out having appeared with parallel and tapered boilers, single and double chimneys, smoke deflectors and in its final form, 46106 Gordon Highlander was unique with its smoke deflectors.

Soon after introduction in 1927 with the single chimney and

parallel boiler, drivers complained of drifting smoke, culminating with a derailment in 1931 where drifting smoke was concluded to be a major factor. Trials were then carried out on four 'Royal Scots' with differing smokebox and smoke deflector designs, the most unusual being on 6161 *Kings Own*. These experiments lasted under a year during 1931/1932 and all the 'Royal Scots' were then fitted with similar smoke deflectors albeit with some subtle differences.

It's always nice to have an unusual locomotive on your layout

as it becomes a talking point with visitors, so I decided to convert a Bachmann 'Royal Scot' to be able to parade a very unusual model on my garden layout. The best pictures of 6161 were reproduced in *The Book of the Royal Scots* by lan Sixsmith published by Irwell Press, an invaluable book to have when converting or changing the identity of any 'Royal Scot'.

The first job was to slice a wedge from the top of the smokebox. I used an Expo knife with a fine razor saw blade to do this. A piece of black plasticard was cut and welded into place with Roket Deluxe plastic glue, then some filler was applied and then filed into shape. I had to estimate by trial and error the shape of the smokebox cowling by cutting and shaping a piece of thin card and holding it in place. When I was satisfied with the result I scanned it, changed its colour to black and printed it on to self-adhesive paper.

The self-adhesive template was stuck to a 0.4mm piece of brass shim. The hole where the chimney was to protrude had a series of small holes drilled around the edge >>>

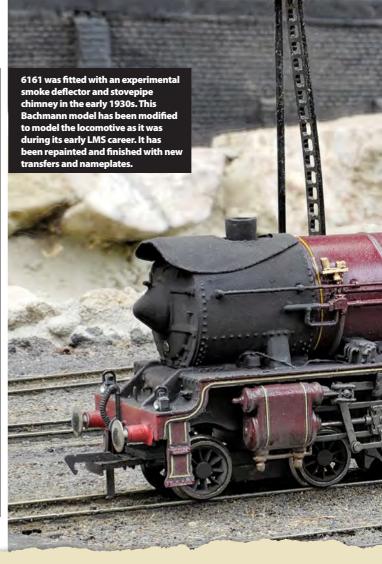


The rebuilt 'Royal Scot' has been produced several times over for 'OO' gauge – it is available for 'N' gauge from Graham Farish too – with the latest generation model being the 2007 released product from Hornby, 6108. The LMS black version from Hornby is joined by a modified Airfix model as 46106 *Gordon Highlander* with its unique straight smoke deflectors from Jackson Evans etched parts and a previous Bachmann model of the rebuilt 'Scot' with standard smoke deflectors.

of the final aperture and a jeweller's saw was inserted to cut out the hole before it was finally fettled with a file. The outer edge of the cowling was cut away with scissors. The cowling was rolled with a large brass 23mm rod and then the front edge was hammered against a bevel which had been turned on the rod to produce a downward lip.

From another piece of brass, the smokebox door was turned on a lathe leaving a shaft to locate in a hole drilled in the centre of the door. A thin plastic washer was glued to the back of the cone to represent the door's mounting.

The smokebox door and cowling were glued into position with Roket Cyano Glue Gel. The 'stovepipe' chimney had been acquired from Alan Gibson and was glued into a pre-drilled hole in the plasticard wedge beneath the cowling. I used thin plastic strip to replace the hinge straps on the smokebox door and fashioned a lamp bracket and soldered it to the cone. Pieces

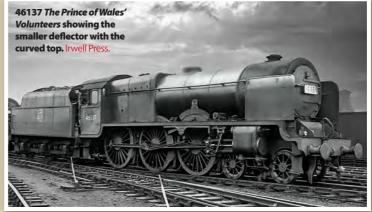

of a staple were used to make the missing smokebox door top clips. After preliminary cleaning up, the front section was sprayed with grey primer making it easier to see where further fettling was required.

I decided to simulate some missing pipework and valves which were made from various scraps and glued into place after which some further work with files and a glass fibre brush took place ready for painting.

I fitted tender pick-ups to improve the model's performance

but, for Mainline and Bachmann split chassis models, finding an easy electrical connection is difficult. My method is to drill two 10BA clearance holes in the plastic chassis keeper plate. This marks the metal split chassis where a 10BA tap hole is drilled with a No 54. drill. This can be tapped to 10BA. The keeper plate which just clips over the chassis front and back is refitted and two leads soldered on to 10BA brass washers and attached to a miniplug. The miniplug is cut from Squires Pin

strips. The socket is glued to the keeper plate and 10BA bolts of the appropriate length fasten the washers with leads to the chassis through the plate. This allows for future removal of the keeper plate for maintenance if required.

In model form, Bachman has produced an LMS liveried parallel boilered version without smoke deflectors and with the three standard types of deflector and a BR green version. Hornby has only produced the rebuilt tapered boilered 'Scot'

in LMS black without smoke deflectors and in BR green with the standard curved ones. No one has modelled rebuilt 'Royal Scot' 46106 Gordon Highlander with the BR standard deflectors in 'OO' gauge – it was done in 'N' gauge by Graham Farish, but Jackson Evans produced an etching so that modellers can carry out their own conversion.

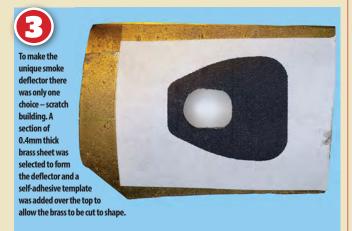

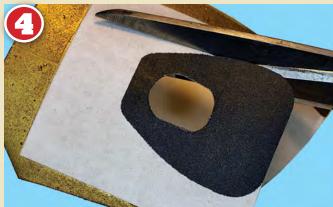
STEP BY STEP MODIFYING A BACHMANN 'ROYAL SCOT' AS 6161 KINGS OWN



The subject of this modification process is 6161 *Kings Own*. The locomotive was built in 1930 at Derby Works and underwent smoke deflector trials in 1932 which resulted in modification of the smokebox top and a unique stovepipe chimney for this 'Royal Scot'.

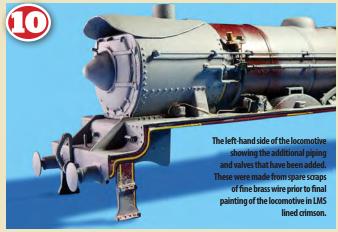

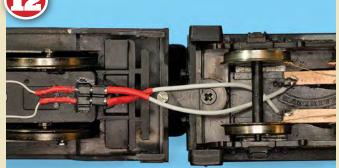

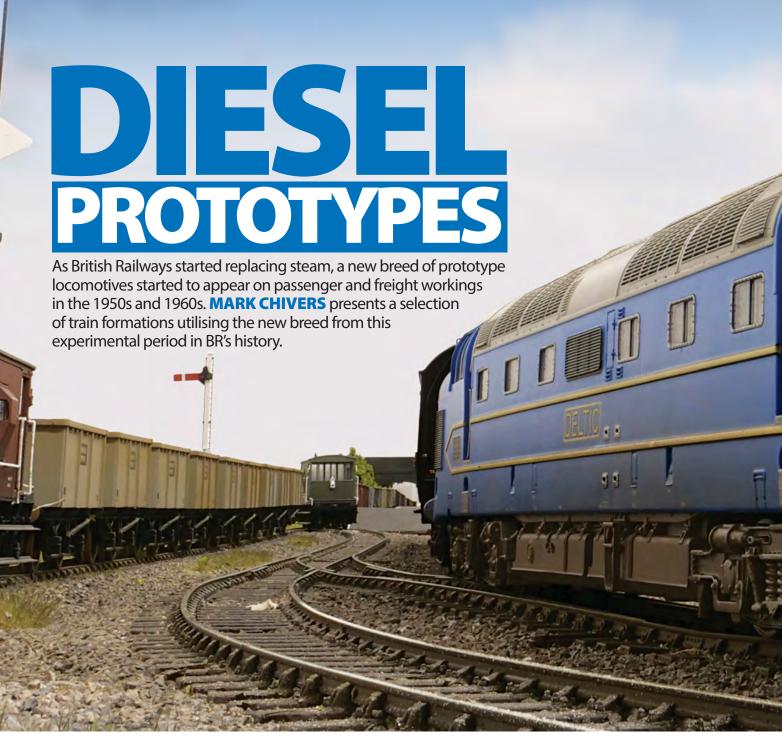

URING the 1950s and 1960s, the railway faced a great deal of change as considerations were being given to replacing steam traction and modernise operations, resulting in some rather eclectic - and colourful - locomotives appearing at the head of test trains, freight turns and passenger workings. Some had a distinct American feel about them such as the late-1940s built LMS Co-Co 'twins' 10000/10001 - and English Electric's Co-Co DP1 Deltic (1955), while others were a little more austere, such as the Swiss built Brown Boveri gas turbine A1A-A1A 18000 (1949) and Bulleid's 1-Co-Co-1 diesels 10201/10202 (1950) and 10203 (1954). The intention was to test these new locomotives on a variety of passenger and freight services with a view to them ultimately replacing steam traction.

Some quite interesting operations followed, such as 10000/10001 on passenger turns ranging from the London Midland Region's (LMR) 'Royal Scot' to the Southern Region's (SR) 'Royal Wessex', while the SR's 10201-10203 were also shared on services ranging from the 'Atlantic Coast Express' and 'Bournemouth Belle' on their home region to the aforementioned 'Royal Scot' on the LMR. Some of these trains were amongst the longest formations on their respective regions, so it was a case of putting the new traction well and truly to the test.

Further prototypes were developed into the 1960s, which offered a kaleidoscope of colour at the time with the appearance of English Electric's (EE) beech leaf brown gas turbine GT3 (1961), EE Co-Co DP2 in BR green (1962), Brush Traction's lime green and brown D0280 Falcon (1962), Birmingham Railway Carriage and Wagon Company's (BRCW) stark white D0260 Lion (1962) and Hawker Siddeley's yellow ochre and brown HS4000 Kestrel (1967) on various test trains and in-service passenger turns – this latter locomotive was even demonstrated at the head of a 50+ wagon test train formed of loaded merry-go-round (MGR) coal hoppers to showcase its capabilities.

MODELS

There has never been a better time to model these prototype locomotives in 'OO', with many of the popular examples now offered in ready-to-run form. In some cases, more than one version of a particular prototype has been produced. For example, the LMS 'twins' 10000/10001 have been the

subject of multiple 21st Century ready-to-run 'OO' gauge projects. FIA Trains unveiled its spectacular brass-bodied examples in 2007, followed by Hattons and Dapol's collaboration, first announced in 2011 and, most recently, Rails of Sheffield and Bachmann's models of 10000/10001 were released to high acclaim in 2015. These latter models were initially exclusive to Rails of Sheffield in their original form, with subsequent examples now available through Bachmann's main range.

Bachmann also worked closely with the National Railway Museum to produce an exclusive 'OO' gauge model of English Electric DP1 Deltic. It has appeared in a selection of guises, all of which are subtle takes on the distinctive bright blue livery it carried. Currently, it is available in East Coast and West

Danish manufacturer Heljan has created something of a niche having developed a series of 'OO' gauge prototype releases in recent years with Brush Traction's D0280 Falcon announced in 2008, followed by HS4000 Kestrel in 2009, together with BRCW D0260 Lion and English Electric Co-Co DP2 in 2011. More recently, the manufacturer has been working exclusively with Rails of Sheffield on the Brown, Boveri gas turbine A1A-A1A locomotive 18000 which is tantalisingly close to production. Kernow Model Rail Centre's

Most recently, KR Models has been developing a 'OO' gauge ready-to-run model of English Electric Gas Turbine 'GT3' (HM163) in its eye-catching beech leaf brown colour scheme. Production models are expected to arrive in the UK imminently for those who pre-ordered the locomotive, while the manufacturer is also considering a second run for those who may have missed out on the initial production. KR Models is also developing further prototype locomotives with plans for the Fell 2-D-2 diesel locomotive 10100, Clayton Diesel Hydraulic Prototype 1 (DHP1) and Bulleid's Southern Railway 'Leader' experimental steam locomotive.

and BR green colour schemes.

Mention should also be made of Silver Fox Models which has specialised in ready-to-run'OO' gauge models of specific prototype locomotives for some years now, with examples including LMS 10000/10001, Bulleid's 1-Co-Co-1 diesels and, currently, the Brown-Boveri A1A-A1A gas turbine 18000 and Metropolitan Vickers Co-Co gas turbine 18100. They feature decorated resin bodyshells on modified ready-to-run chassis.

ROLLING STOCK

From a rolling stock perspective, most of the prototype locomotives were put to work hauling main line rolling stock (regional and BR Mk 1/Mk 2 stock), so there is plenty of choice when it comes to suitable 'OO' gauge carriages and wagons for them to haul from the main manufacturers – there is even a model of the LNER Dynamometer Car (Locomotion Models) for 'OO' should you wish

to use a little modeller's licence.

Given the purpose of utilising these prototype locomotives was to discover what they were capable of in regular service, some of the duties they performed operated with up to 14 or 15 carriages, in some cases. From a modeller's perspective we have reduced this to a maximum of ten vehicles through selective compression for some of the formations. Also, where a readyto-run 'OO' gauge model of a particular vehicle is not currently available, a similar alternative may have been substituted.

By no means exhaustive, the following collection of train formations aims to offer just a taster of those headed by a selection of these eclectic prototype locomotives during the 1950s and 1960s.

FANTASY

ETWEEN THEM, the ready-to-run manufacturers have covered most of the major livery variations among the available locomotive classes. Many of the remaining gaps – especially when it comes to one-offs and specials – have been filled by special commissions from retailers and magazines. Yet there will always be those liveries that are just too obscure to make sound commercial sense, as well as one-off fantasy paint jobs created

to suit the whims of the owner. This is where skill at repainting comes in extremely useful.

Another good reason for repainting a model is because the one you have isn't in the livery you want – or that a rare, limited edition has become simply too rare for your pocket. If you're particular about detail – and ready-to-run models these days come with a level of individuality that's light years from the one-size-fits-all philosophy that prevailed

for many years – you'll probably find that the manufacturers have already produced a bodyshell that suits your chosen prototype perfectly, except that it's not available in the livery you want. Conversely, it may be in the correct colours, but have the wrong points of detail for the prototype you want to model.

Repainting models to your own exact specification isn't difficult but it does involve following a procedure - and you have to be careful about what you're doing and the order in which you do it. Don't rush it. I'd suggest getting any remedial work the model needs out of the way first – certainly if it involves any cutting, filling and filing – but adding or replacing any detail parts afterwards.

If you need any special paint colours or transfers, make sure you buy them before you start work. Plan ahead and work out a sequence. Never hurry and



STEP BY STEP A GUIDE TO REPAINTING LOCOMOTIVES



You can't simply paint over the top of an existing scheme — modelling paint hasn't got the greatest covering power and all the livery elements will show through unless you take care to eradicate them. Rather than spend ages masking details such as windows and etched grilles, I'd be inclined to strip the model down to a bare shell before starting work.

An airbrush is pretty well essential, although you can use aerosols. For newcomers to airbrushing, a simple hobby spray tool such as this Badger 250 would be perfectly adequate for such work provided you accept its limitations. We took a long hard look at budget airbrushes like this in HM91 (January 2015).



The Iwata Revolution CR is my go-to choice for straight repainting projects.

Its 0.5mm nozzle means it can put a lot of paint on without fear of blocking, while being an Iwata it has a wonderful subtlety of touch.



don't cut corners. Make sure the previous coat is absolutely bone dry before handling it, let alone moving on to the next stage. If you've never repainted a model before, I suggest you try it first on something that doesn't matter such as an old wagon, rather than on a cherished (and expensive) locomotive.

To demonstrate the processes involved, let's see what happens with some locomotives from my own collection.

DETAILS TO WATCH FOR - A TEN-POINT PLAN

- It may be easier to partially dismantle the model before repainting it – masking small details can be laborious and time-consuming.
- Enamel paint is more durable than acrylic for basic livery applications – but aerosol car paint (also acrylic!) is tougher still.
- Don't stint on masking tape
 overspray can and does
- travel further than you think. Use only high-quality tape intended specifically for model-making.
- Spray lighter colours first if at all possible, using a suitable primer/undercoat.
- Apply several light coats rather than one heavy one.
- Move your airbrush or aerosol steadily over the work at a constant distance.
- Wait until each application is totally dry (allow at least 24 hours) before masking up and applying the next colour.
- Remove masking tape immediately once the paint is touch-dry.
- Apply transfers and final detail only when all painting is complete.
- I rarely feel the need to use varnish or a protective finish.

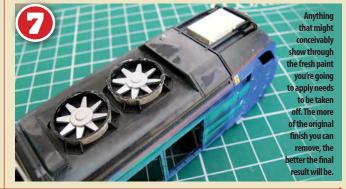


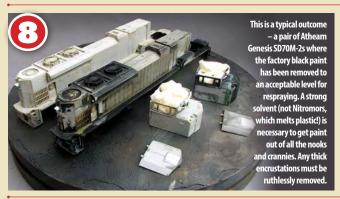

DB Cargo's simple but elegant livery suits the Class 68s well, I feel. For a four-axle design, these locomotives are a lot longer than you might imagine – less than a metre shorter than a six-axle Class 66.





With a few detail modifications and upgrades along the way, the Lima Class 73 has morphed into a wholly imaginary 73302 from the long-vanished (and much missed) Fastline fleet. The branding, intended for a Class 56, came from Fox Transfers.

TIP

One of the most important steps in repainting a locomotive is removing the original livery from the bodyshell - and particularly printed detail. Not doing this will result in impressions under the paint. Using a suitable model paint stripper is the best method.



This Heljan Class 47 began life as an undecorated bodyshell but was repainted using LifeColor acrylics — yellow ends first, then blue — to represent one of the final Brush-built batch, the only ones to be blue from the start. Uniquely, they had oversized logos and carried their worksplates on the cab doors at No. 1 end. I don't know if this version has ever been covered in ready-to-run form — there were only nine of them.

T'S EASY TO BECOME OVER FOCUSED on the railway side of a model scene - we are definitely guilty of that – but there are a wide range of operating accessories on the market including the long-standing Faller Car System which can add to the scene outside the railway boundary.

The Faller Car System offers a way of adding moving road vehicles to a model railway which can be as simple or as complex as you want it to be. It is made to operate with 'HO' scale 1:87 road vehicles, most of which are of modern era designs, but it is equally usable on a 'OO' gauge layout as the vehicles won't look out of place alongside British outline locomotives and rolling stock. Plus, as we plan to show in future issues, it is perfectly possible to adapt the powered road vehicle chassis for use in British outline 1:76 scale vehicles.

The basis for this project is a standard Faller Car System starter set produced for the British market by Gaugemaster and available from its retailer network across the UK. The kit combines a Mercedes Sprinter van (in 'HO' scale) with a custom set of vehicle transfers which include Network Rail and Gaugemaster logos together with Faller contact wire, roadway filler, roadway paint, roadside accessories and an instruction sheet.

STEP BY STEP INSTALLING THE FALLER CAR SYSTEM



The Faller Car System is a comprehensive range of products allowing all manner of road systems to be created from the simple to the complex. The starting point for this guide is the Gaugemaster branded starter set (Cat No. FA161504) which contains all the components required to start including vehicle, contact wire, roadway plaster and paint plus additional accessories.

There are a number of additional starter sets available with lorries included while you can also buy additional packs of contact wire, roadway filler, paint and other accessories as well as individual vehicles of varying types.

MAKING A ROAD

Use of the Faller Car System means thinking about how the road will operate. It requires a circuit in order for vehicles to run continuously and, depending on the length of the road, multiple vehicles can run around the circuit. The vehicles can also master gradients up to a maximum of 12%.

Our scheme provides a 20ft circuit running around the diversion route on Topley Dale which includes a turnback at each end. These have been hidden behind scenic features to provide a sort of 'storage yard' for the vehicles - although they don't stop in these areas. The scheme employs laying of the Faller contact wire on top of our previously created roadbed followed by a skim of Faller roadway filler. However, if you are planning a layout from scratch which you wish to add the car system to, you can consider use of the laser cut road sections. These include curves, straights and junctions to allow a fully working street scene to be created.

The road route for our layout is quite simple as it is a continuous run without junctions, but again you can build beyond this with additional accessories to introduce multiple route options for vehicles to follow with either control devices or multiple contact wires laid adjacent to each other for different vehicles to follow.

The complications of the road on our scene include a gradient over the small river bridge, two tight corners to pass underneath the railway and to complete this scene for the Faller Car System

a long 5ft gradient rising from below to above the railway along the back scene. The starter pack supplied all the components we needed (we even had contact wire left over), although we did add a second vehicle in the FedEx Mercedes lorry to expand its operational value.

STEP BY STEP

In this step by step guide we will show you how we went about installing the Faller Car System on the Topley Dale diversion route to complement the railway scene and you can see video of the finished scene on our latest Hornby Magazine Show which is available to watch now at www. keymodelworld.com/online-exclusives together with footage of the scenery around the road and the baseboard expansion taking shape.

Having installed the basic starter system, we already have ideas about expanding the vehicle fleet and adding Faller chassis to British vans, buses and lorries. As soon as we do, we'll show the process here in Hornby Magazine as we continue to develop the potential of this exciting system. Em



STEP BY STEP INSTALLING THE FALLER CAR SYSTEM



In order to accommodate the circuit for the Faller Car System on our test track, we extended the baseboard with an extra section of 9mm plywood. This was set lower than the original board to allow for a water feature which will be added later.



Our road will be two-way which requires a turnback at each end. To accommodate each of these returns, a space was made with the lower return underneath the main trackbed.



Most of the road had already been built. It passes under the bridge then climbs up behind the railway to a second turnback at the top of the hill. The front section of road will be extended onto the new



The extension to the already completed road was built in the same way using redundant Foamex from signage. This is easily cut to shape with a craft knife and is flexible enough to allow it to take in small gradients. Using a pair of '00' gauge lorries, we marked the width of the road and its route.



A mistake in the shaping of the road meant that it went outside the width of the baseboard. We cut the Foamex road bed into two sections and flipped one over to change its route slightly which solved the problem.



The roadbed was then glued in place over blocks of polystyrene to create a route to a small bridge and then taped over with masking tape to ensure it stayed in place while the glue dried. The red lines indicate the position of the Faller contact wire which will guide the vehicles.



With the roadbed complete, the next step is to lay down the Faller contact wire. It is held in place with double-sided sticky tape which has been laid along the road in the position where the wire will go. The wire guides the vehicles, so its position is important.



Peel back the covering from the double sided tape and the contact wire can be laid along the road. Lay it in 500mm-700mm lengths with 2mm gaps in between each section to avoid expansion problems.

Both contact wires have now been laid on this section. They have been set far enough apart to allow two lorries to pass in all places.



It doesn't look pretty at this stage, but this is the tumback at the bottom of the road system. Tight curves can be accommodated but be aware that a smooth surface like this isn't conducive to operating $the \ Faller \ cars - Faller's \ roadway \ filler \ and \ road \ paint \ provide \ the \ right \ grip \ and \ traction \ for \ the \ cars.$



The Faller roadway filler (also called kniving filler) is supplied in the starter pack in a 500g pack. It is mixed in a 2:1 ratio with water to create the road surface. Start by pouring one part water (we used half a cup).



Next add one cup (of the same size) of roadway filler into the water and start mixing it immediately to avoid clumps and lumps.

Once mixed the filler can be applied over the roadway. The aim is to get the filler as near as possible to the level of the contact wire as it is essential that the contact wire sits at the surface of the road for best operation.





Work around the road looking for problem areas including lumps on top of the contact wire which will stop the magnet on the bottom of the vehicles from moving.







Once the second layer of filler had set, it was sanded back again and a quick test run was carried out to check for any further issues around the circuit.

Having completed the first round of sanding, we mixed a second batch of roadway filler and added small amounts at the points where there were dips or where the contact wire was sitting too proud from the surface.

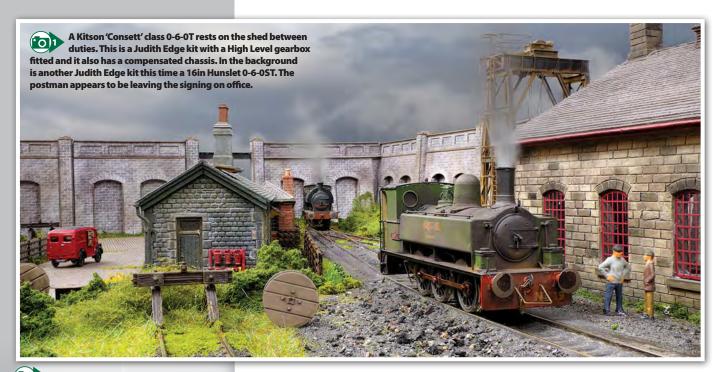

Drawing on the heavy industry of North Eastern England, IAN FORSYTH created this atmospheric colliery layout in 'OO' which showcases a long disappeared railway scene.

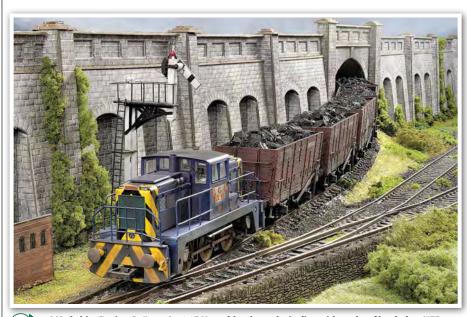
HAVE BEEN INTERESTED in model railways since I was very young when my dad brought home some Tri-ang models, a black Stanier 'Princess Royal' 4-6-2 as 46201 Princess Elizabeth and a 'Jinty'0-6-0T with a couple of Mk 1 coaches and several wagons. That was it - I was hooked.

The actual layout Fence Houses NCB (National Coal Board) came about a couple of years ago. We had decided to move house, so I had to dismantle my large and very incomplete loft layout. All my stock had to be boxed up, track bundled up, boards dismantled and so on. The house move didn't happen as planned, so I decided to build a small layout based on an NCB shed having been inspired by John Cook's Keiper Colliery after seeing it at Stevenage exhibition a couple of years ago. I rebuilt a baseboard along with a frame to support it, typically 4ft x 2ft with 6mm

plywood laid on 3in x 1in timber framing. Prior to starting the layout I had been collecting and building a number of NCB locomotives and my last layout, Kiln Road,

was based on BR North Eastern Region and NCB practices. With all that together I had a really clear idea of what I wanted to achieve right from the start so I could see and use all my NCB collection together. I had plenty of track and points to reuse from the Peco code 100 range with live frog points.

Track laying started with the main board, but it soon became apparent that this was not going to be large enough for the full scene, so I rebuilt another board from the original loft layout and in the end the layout grew to 13ft x 2ft. I now had a BR running line and separate industrial coal board line which I decided needed an incline. It also soon became clear that the storage yard wasn't going to be large enough either, so another 18in long board was added. >>



A Yorkshire Engine Co'Janus' 0-6-0DH rumbles down the incline with a rake of loaded ex-NER hoppers. The tunnel mouth is very tight and the idea came from pictures of Tyneside docks where the two steeple cab electric locomotives used to work.



TRADITIONAL CONTROL

I wired up one board at a time, each wire being tagged at the start and end of its run. These are soldered to tag strips at the board ends and from these the connections are soldered to 25 or 37-way 'D' plugs. Each board is dealt with in the same way. To avoid any confusion, where there are two plugs on the end of a board, one with male ends and the other female which match up with their counterparts on the other board so the cable routes cannot get mixed up. All wires are colour coded, black for rail common return, red for rail sections, green for signals, blue for point motors, pink for point motor common.

Control is purely analogue. I use a Gaugemaster transformer and two panel mounted controllers. In the control panel it is wired up as cab control so either controller can be used on any rail section. All section switches are doublepole, double-throw centre-off. Up selects controller A, and down for B. Testing took place and to my amazement it all worked with only a few adjustments. I used this control system on my previous Kiln Road layout. Once complete, I spent a considerable length of time test running the locomotives and stock up and down all the sections of track until I was completely happy with it.

Once smooth running had been obtained and I was happy with the track plan and every length of track had a reason for being there, I painted the rails and sleepers in various shades of brown, rust and black. Ballasting then started using fine cinders or ash. Referring to photographs of the real thing comes in useful. Some considerable time was taken on this task as I didn't want to get ballast into the point mechanisms! I used an old wagon to check for any problems with ballast on the track and check rails.

SHED SCENE

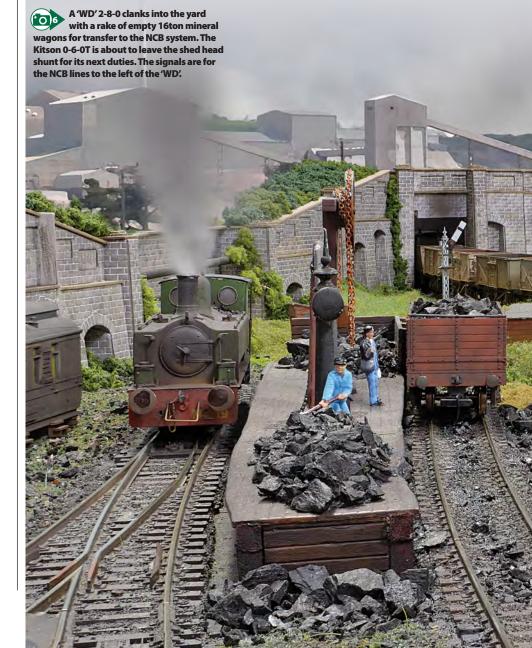
Next I turned my attention to the engine shed area. I'd already cut an inspection pit into the board and I really liked the look of a shed area with block stonework. A chance visit to Barnstaple's Osbourne Models turned up laser cut stone/block, exactly what I wanted. I also acquired some very good dry-stone walling. I painted and weathered the block stone and then carefully fitted them in the engine shed area by gluing and pinning as required they give a very good effect. The engine

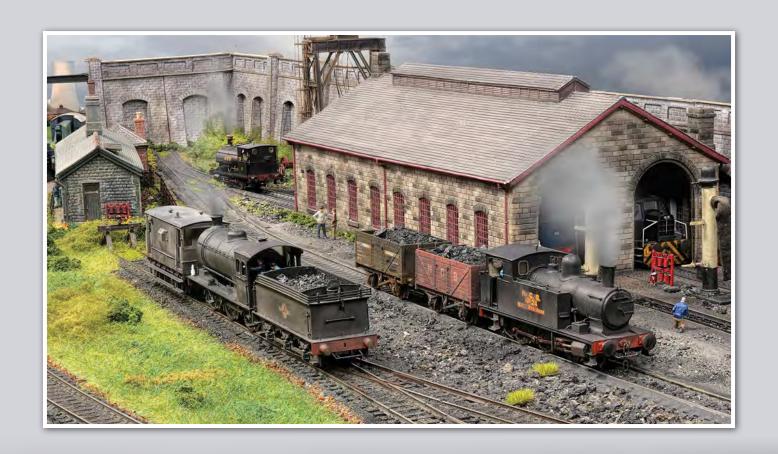

shed building is a Bachmann Scenecraft model made of resin and is a typical North Eastern Railway design. I have used real crushed clinker and ash in this area to try and capture the feel of a shed. Unable to find the right type of water crane, I have used two Highland Railway water cranes. They are quite old models, but the design is not far off. To fill a space, I built a fire iron tool rack from nickel silver wire.

I've tried to capture the atmosphere of a Durham and Northumberland coalfield engine shed. I can't stress enough the use of reference books. If looking at a locomotive, take a closer look at the surrounding »

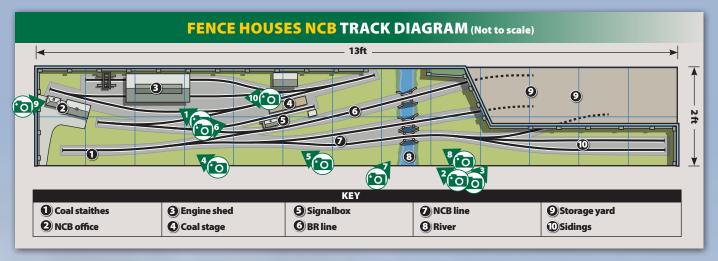
area as there is always detail there.

To provide a backdrop to the railway I opted for the Metcalfe card system, for all 15ft of it. The scenery was built up using broken polystyrene blocks which was then covered with either wet glued paper and plaster of Paris or Polyfilla. The raw landscape was painted green or brown when fully dried.

The actual scenery is from various sources such as the excellent Footpath range, along with static grass, but you will notice there are no trees on the layout. This may seem a bit strange but I didn't see any in my reference books and I'd talked to somebody at an exhibition who'd lived in the Sunderland area during the 1960s and he said virtually the same - running lines





all over the place but hardly any trees. I worked on the scenery one board at a time but had the next board in place to keep the scene 'flowing'. The dry-stone walling was superglued down before any scenic work was carried out and being foam, it took up

the shape I needed to good effect. I tried to take any harsh edges out as I went along.

The two signalboxes are from the Hornby range and, being of North Eastern Railway design, look really good. They were installed as I went along doing the scenery. It is amazing what your friends can come up with. There was this odd little plastic shed on a layout that was going to be broken up and it's now the engine shed signing on office. The cobble stone effect is card from Metcalfe, although I have »



weathered and toned it down along with some grass growing amongst the stones.

ON SHOW

This was always going to be an exhibition layout from the start, so I had to make sure that it would fit into my estate car along with all the boxes required for the layout. Just before the lockdown, it went to its first exhibition at East Grinstead, behaved itself and everything ran well. I like exhibiting at shows and this layout is something slightly different. Roll on when things get back to normal.

I have so far built nine Slaters NER hopper wagons, these being finished in a NCB red oxide livery and each one has been filled with real coal and weathered. The fine details include transfers from Railtec plus buffers from Lanarkshire Models. Many hundreds of this type of wagon ended their days in NCB ownership and I have another six to build. To see this rake of wagons behind a Kitson Consett class locomotive is very satisfying. I got a bit carried away with kit building: there are two Ayrshire NCB locomotives and others from out of the area running, but rule one applies - it's my layout and I like them. There are also two Ratio Midland Railway coaches finished in a washed-out brown and are used for a local miners' train.

In terms of operation, the British Railways locomotives bring in empty wagons for the NCB to then take away to the various parts of the industrial system. They in turn bring in the full wagons and the BR locomotives take them away. Various other supplies

such as steel are brought in by rail. I also run a special consisting of three Gresley suburban coaches hauled by a 'J21' 0-6-0 with a prototypical reporting number. This in turn has a NCB locomotive coupled up which then takes it onto the NCB system. BR and the NCB share running rights over the 'main line' at the back of the layout along with the use of the run-round facilities. All other lines are for the coal board only. In the shed area I generally just keep the BR locomotive to the coaling and water area.

The locomotives on the layout are a mixture of ready-to-run and kit-built models, the latter being my favourite part of railway modelling along with the research. Most if not all of the locomotives have a crew, and the newer models have the excellent ModelU figures wherever practical. The kits are a mix of Dave Alexander Models, High Level, Judith Edge and Agenoria Models. The wagons are a mix of ready-to-run and kit built. All are weathered, as are the locomotives.

EXTRA FEATURES

The layout had to have working signals. As I was one third of the owning group of friends who owned Frank Dyers' Borchester Market layout a few years ago, just seeing and having to operate the signals on the layout had an effect, never to be forgotten: the signals on that layout were the work of a pure genius. I saw the Dapol motorised signal system working and decided that was what I wanted and settled for its GWR lower quadrant signals for the NCB system, these being a close

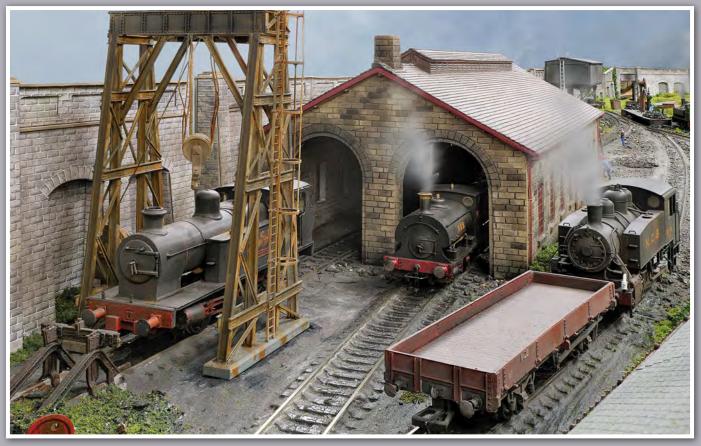
representation of the prototype. I used the SR lattice signal for the LNER type. The signals have their own 12v DC supply and 'bounce' effect which works well.

During construction of the baseboards, I added a riverbed. I have used the Bachmann water system along with their Woodland Scenics paints and am generally quite pleased with the results, except for the bit the cat stood on. The rocks (small pebbles) are from a riverbed on the North Yorkshire Moors. The two rail bridges are from the South Eastern Finecast range and were added as the scenery was being built up. The wider of the two bridges has a collection of water on it and I added some rust to the steel platework.

I must thank Trevor Jones for the excellent photographs and several members of the Newhaven MRC - Charlie Bloomfield, Ray Warner and Bob Smith - for allowing me to bounce ideas off them, especially in these difficult times. I must not forget my better half Denise who has had to put up with the mess whilst I built Fence Houses NCB and other model railway activites.

I have several plans for Fence Houses NCB, the main one being to add a couple of static sidings on top of the storage yard with a low or half relief model of a screening plant. I also have a MPD layout based in the York area, Holly Bank Grove, several main line and industrial locomotive kits still to build and the typical stockpile of future modelling projects. I'm also building a large finer 'OO' gauge BR(NE) 'tail chaser' layout. I'm going to be busy – but in these strange times, that can only be a good thing!

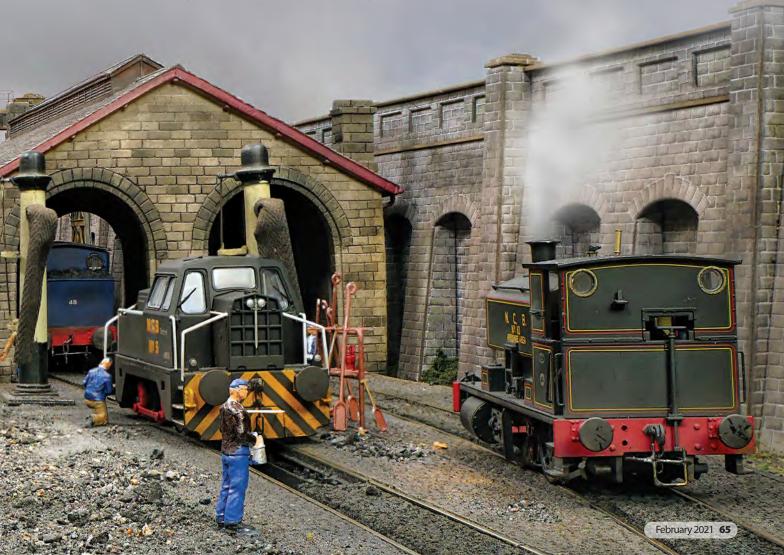

TYPE I REVIEW REVIEW REVISION

The Class 20 has been a long-standing part of the Bachmann 'OO' gauge range, but only now has the missing piece of the 'Chopper' jigsaw been completed – the Class 20/3. **MIKE WILD** takes a detailed look at this revised Class 20 which models the rebuilds completed for DRS in the 1990s and early 2000s.

HE ENGLISH ELECTRIC
Class 20 is an understated icon of the early diesel era. The first entered service in 1957 and the fleet of 228 locomotives became the standard Type 1 (1,000hp or less) for British Railways and went on in front line service until the arrival of the Class 60s at the start of the 1990s.

That should have been the end of the Class 20 story on the mainline, but Direct Rail Services - which was created by British Nuclear Fuels for the transport of nuclear traffic by rail – saw the opportunity to refurbish this hardy workhorse for a new lease of life. In turn it created a brand-new sub class - Class 20/3 - with each of its 15 locomotives going through a rigorous rebuilding and refurbishment process. The first was completed in 1996 and the last entered service in 2005 and, following subsequent withdrawal by DRS, some have since gone on to find new work with Harry Needle Railroad Company for spot hire and stock movements as well as the seasonal Railhead Treatment Trains.

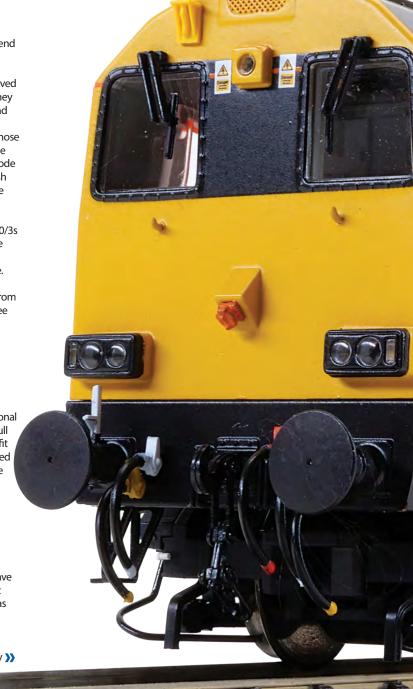
Reality Check looks back at the genesis of the Class 20/3 on pages 72-75 while here we will be focusing on the all-new model of this distinctive sub class from Bachmann for 'OO' gauge.

THE MODEL

Bachmann has had the Class 20 in its portfolio for two decades and has modelled both the disc headcode and centre headcode versions in a variety of BR and preservation era colour schemes. However, the Class 20/3 refurbished fleet has never been available as a ready-to-run model in any scale making this all-new release from Bachmann all the more important.

The refurbished 20/3s were significantly different to the original locomotives. The front end layout received modern WIPAC light clusters, multiple working sockets, radio aerials and improved glazing while along the body they gained long range fuel tanks and the internals were completely refreshed too. The bonnet end nose received similar treatment to the cab front with either the headcode discs or box giving way to a flush design, matching lighting to the cab and DRS' own specification of multiple working socket was added. Interestingly the Class 20/3s could (and did) work in multiple with the Class 37/6s for DRS as well as in pairs of the same type.

Bachmann's new 'OO' gauge model has been created fresh from the ground up – nothing you see here has any heritage with the previous version of the original condition locomotives. As you would expect there are sprung metal buffers at all four corners together with NEM coupling pockets which support small tension lock couplings. An optional pack of accessories includes a full set of bufferbeam pipes which fit straight into the holes as supplied without any modification. There are also additional parts which can be fitted to the underside for static models plus a spare small tension lock coupling for the cab end should you wish to have couplings at both ends.

fitted windscreen wipers. The cab roof has a radio pod while there is flush glazing to the side windows, separately fitted metal handrails at the doors and a neatly detailed interior which includes control desk features, handbrake wheel and seating.

Moving along the locomotive and the impressive detailing continues. The bogies are fabulously finished with separately fitted pipework which has even been painted white, die-cast sand boxes, sandpipes, brake shoes and neatly moulded spring detail. The axleboxes even have the BRTimken legend moulded on to them. The

central battery box is equally well done and features full relief detail underneath while the central air tank moulding is removable for access to the lighting switches.

Completing the locomotive is a neatly detailed engine compartment with all of its 'cupboard doors' and finely moulded grilles while the roof fan grille is an etched part which allows a full view of the fan inside.

Our sample model of 20311 in its current HNRail orange livery which is really quite eye catching. The simple body colours have been reproduced to Bachmann's usual exacting standard, while the detail finishing of the printed detail such as electrification flashes, locomotive numbers, data panels and warning labels is nothing short of outstanding.

PERFORMANCE

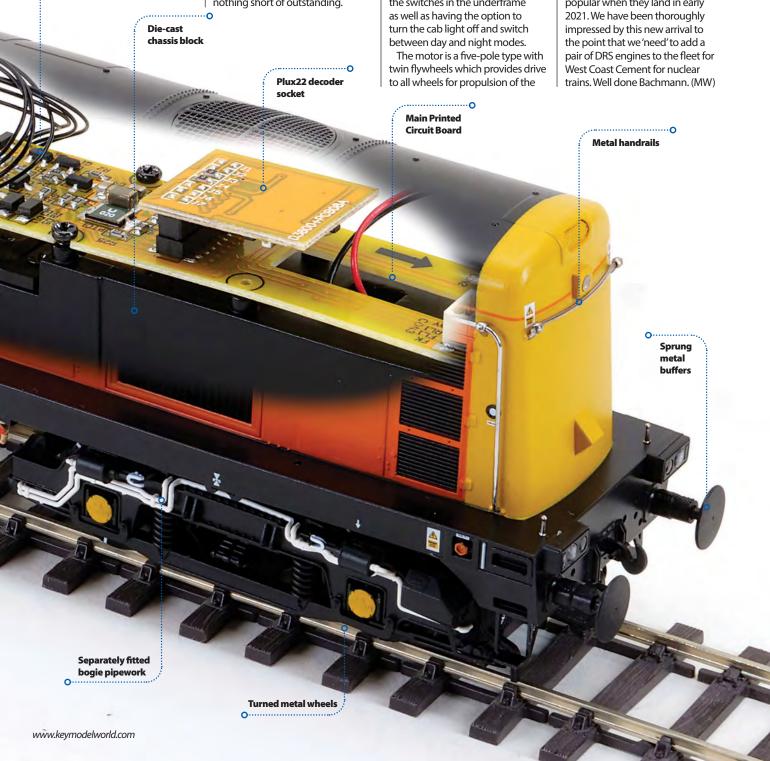
It's not just the outside of the Class 20/3 that is new – the internals have been completely reworked too to provide space for a comprehensive suite of electronics. For starters this new model has a Plux22 decoder socket while there is also a factory fitted 15mm x 11mm 8ohm cube speaker mounted on the main Printed Circuit Board (PCB) to make sound installation as simple as removing the decoder blank and plugging in your choice of decoder.

There is also now much more wiring inside to allow full operation of the lighting which consists of directional lights and cab lights. Impressively, even with analogue control, you can switch the cab or nose end lights off independently using the switches in the underframe as well as having the option to turn the cab light off and switch between day and night modes.

Class 20. On the track we found the mechanism to be responsive straight from the box while offering smooth speed transitions throughout its range and ample haulage capacity to keep a 30 wagon rake of HAA hoppers on the move – more than enough for this Type 1 1,000hp single cab diesel.

OVERALL

The refurbished Class 20/3s have been a missing link in the modern era diesel scene since they were introduced, and it is pleasing to see that Bachmann has gone the extra mile to create this locomotive from the ground up with the modern features which it deserves. The finish, detailing and performance are all excellent and we can see all three versions of the 20/3 being extremely popular when they land in early 2021. We have been thoroughly impressed by this new arrival to the point that we 'need' to add a pair of DRS engines to the fleet for West Coast Cement for nuclear



CLASS 205

Throughout railway history there have been many instances of obsolete equipment being repurposed for a second life, with few being as successful as the rebuilding of a small fleet of almost 40-year-old locomotives to become the Class 20/3s, as **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** explains.

HE EARLY YEARS OF privatisation were turbulent times. Money was tight and the future of some forms of traffic uncertain. One of the problem areas was that which dealt with strategically or nationally important materials, such as nuclear waste, which it was felt should not be handed over to the new privatised operators.

To deal with this traffic, a company called Direct Rail Services (DRS) was formed in 1994 as a directly-owned subsidiary of British Nuclear Fuels, a nationalised company, ensuring this vital traffic was retained under the Government's control. Its primary function was to handle nuclear flask traffic, but it was also employed in transferring imported nuclear waste to its site at Sellafield in Cumbria. Later it expanded into other areas, such as intermodal trains, and today continues to operate, although it is now part of the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority.

As with the other companies, DRS had to obtain some motive power of its own but in the mid-1990s there was not much to choose from. Most of the available main line traction had been supplied as part of BR's 1950s modernisation plan and as a result, some four decades later, the majority of locomotives were reaching the end of their working lives. New equipment was also

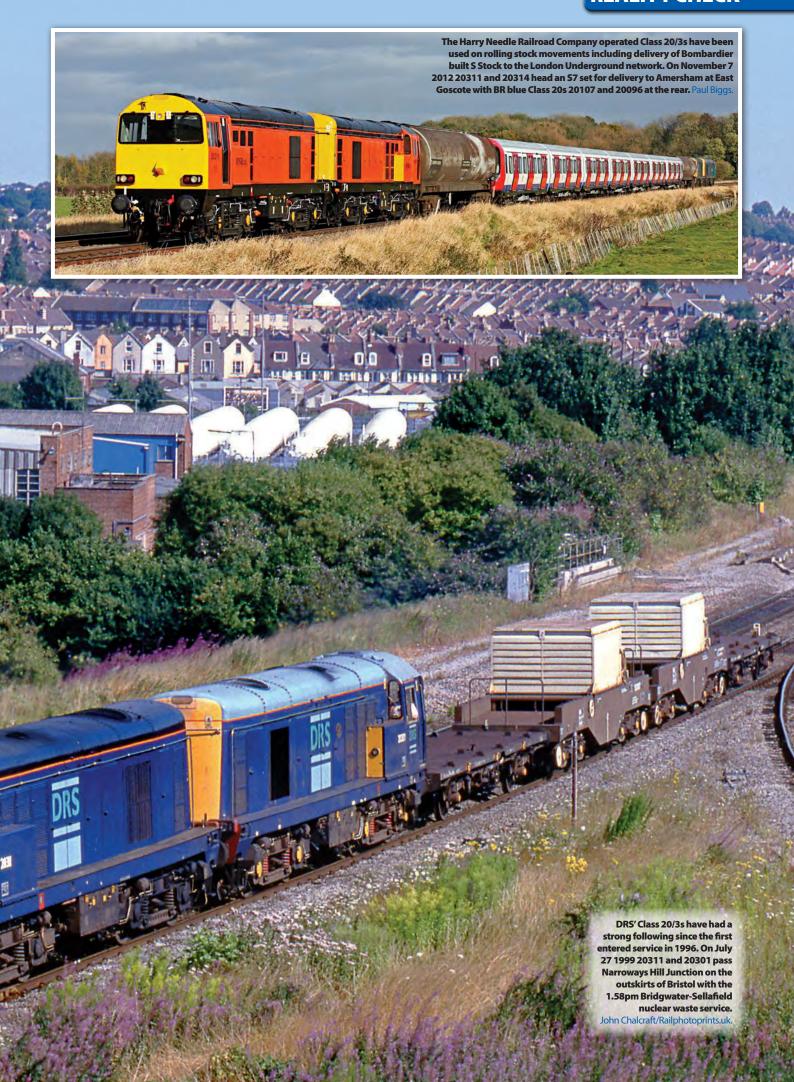
hard to come by, with BR's own workshops undergoing the upheaval of privatisation and the principle of importing new traction from abroad not yet fully established.

DRS' requirement was for a small number of medium-powered locomotives of simple, robust and reliable design and, after examination of what was available, the choice fell on the Class 20, a 1,000hp design which had been one of the first types to be obtained by BR as it turned from steam to diesel. By this time, most of the class had been stood down, and many had been scrapped. There was little work for what remained due to an emphasis on newer and more powerful designs which hauled longer and heavier bulk trains.

Five of the best survivors were selected for upgrade and a contract was let with Brush at Loughborough for the work to be carried out. Included in this was replacement of some of the electronic components with more reliable, modern versions and a comprehensive cab upgrade which saw better side windows fitted, which can easily be identified by their square shape. In the process, all the locomotives selected lost their headcode discs or indicator boxes and were fitted with prominent multiple working connections and modern light clusters. The external appearance was further changed by the addition of extra fuel tanks next to the cab.



REALITY CHECK



While DRS was making its decision, others were going through the same process and this led to some other Class 20s passing to new owners. These included Hunslet-Barclay, Racal-BRT and Waterman Railways with some of the locomotives selected in later years passing to DRS either for subsequent modification or for use as they were.

'NEXT GENERATION' CLASS 20

The first pair of DRS upgrades, 20301-20302 were outshopped in January 1996, with trials being operated between Sellafield, Drigg and Barrow-in-Furness on January 28. Two days later they were tested on a nitric acid train from Ince. Fame followed in the May when the pair was commandeered to work the Royal Train over the Cambrian Main Line to Aberystwyth, where weight restrictions prevented the use of the usual motive power. There was a further notable working on June 1 when the first three engines, 20301-20303, were used in multiple to work the 'Cumbrian Coaster' railtour between Crewe and Workington.

They were first used for their intended work on September 19 when 20301-20302 took four nuclear material-carrying wagons from Sellafield and Barrow. Once the first five engines were in traffic, DRS found that the class was ideally-suited to the lightweight trains that it usually operated and as a result a decision was made to place a second order for further refurbished machines.

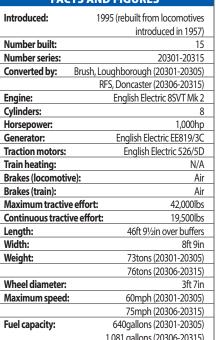
During 1997, DRS purchased a further 18 Class 20s, including the remaining part of the Racal-BRT fleet and five locomotives that had been employed on Channel Tunnel work but which had ended up as part of the Waterman empire. Most of these were taken to RFS at Doncaster, which had won the contract for the second batch of conversions. and from them ten were selected which in time became 20306-20315. The upgrade work undertaken was very similar to the first batch, although there were differences to the fuel tank arrangements,

Initially the Class 20/3s were dedicated to nuclear fuel traffic, but DRS also sought to expand its portfolio and the class were used in trials of 'Piggyback' services for the transport of road trailers. On July 19 1997 20303 and 20304 stand at Penrith before departming for Chadwell Heath Dairy in London. Gordon Edgar.

which affected the overall weight.

On March 11 1998, 20306-20307 were the first to emerge, being tested between Doncaster and Newcastle on the East Coast Main Line. On March 30, the first of these appeared on an intermodal trial for Eddie Stobart, double heading with 37611, and running from Daventry to Hunterston in Scotland. Some of this second batch also spent some time working freight from Cardiff to Crewe.

EXTENDED REACH

With more of the type available and with DRS expanding its operations into other areas it was inevitable that the Class 20/3s would appear on a wide range of workings. The type was often used for route learning and as such made appearances in Glasgow, Ayr, Bridgewater and Dungeness amongst other places. A pair has also worked a rake of empty Mk 1 coaches from Carnforth to Bounds Green in London and return in connection with railtour workings and the class was also used on a well-publicised trial Penrith-Cricklewood milk train.

DRS also bid for and was successful in gaining some of the lucrative Railhead Treatment Train work, and the Class 20/3s became staple traction on these turns for a number of years. More mundane duties saw many of the class working between Barrow and Sellafield with nuclear waste trains but also to and from nuclear power stations all over the country with nuclear flasks.

Although the conversions were successful and gave the locomotives a further life of almost 20 years, the expansion of the

DRS fleet, particularly into Class 37s, saw their sphere of work reduced. In addition, spares, many of which had been supplied by cannibalising other locomotives, were becoming harder to obtain. Subsequently the three locomotives that were in the worst mechanical condition were taken out of service and were used as a source of spares for the rest.

As demand further declined, 20311/20314 were sold to Harry Needle Railroad Company based at Barrow Hill and added to that company's contract fleet. In early 2013, several locomotives were moved from store to CF Booth's scrapyard at Rotherham where they were broken up. These included 20306/307/310/313/315 and these were all cut up by around March that year. Three more locomotives, 20304/308/309, were advertised for sale in 2018 with all being listed as having defects including worn wheelsets and other issues. Those locomotives that remained were placed in store at Barrow Hill Roundhouse near Chesterfield, with some such as 20301 being in a heavily stripped condition. The two passed on to HNRC remained active until relatively recently, although a failure during November has caused the company to examine whether the pair should be retained or withdrawn from service. Meanwhile, DRS itself used 20302/303/305 sporadically in the 2019 railhead season and there was a 'Class 20 Farewell Tour' in January 2020 with a run from York to Crewe, which was hauled by 20302 and 20305.

REMARKABLE SURVIVORS

With DRS having published a traction policy in August 2018 which stated that

it wished to eliminate much of its heritage traction, and with the first to go said to be the Class 20/3s, it is remarkable that the remaining locomotives have managed to hang on as long as they have. The remaining examples have been out of use now for some time, although there are rumours that at least two could be used for the experimental fittings of European Train Control System equipment. Currently one, 20303 is stranded at York with what are said to be wheelset issues.

Given that the Class 20/3 upgrade was performed on locomotives that were already almost 40 years old, the fact that some have survived for another quarter of a century in main line service is nothing short of remarkable and says a great deal about the simplicity and robustness of the original English Electric design. With the official farewell tour for the class now being almost a year ago and with still a couple of examples still theoretically being around on the main line, it would be premature to write the final epitaph for this class. Even final withdrawal may not be the complete end as so popular are these engines that at least one may end up at one or other of our heritage railways.

During August 1999 a short-term nuclear waste flow commenced from Winfrith to Crewe Basford Hall (for Sellafield) powered by DRS Motive Power. Demonstrating the Class 20/3s ability to work in multiple with the DRS Class 37/6s, 20314 pilots 37607 past Moreton, Dorset on September 3 1999.

HE CLASS 50s HAVE always been popular, but the repainting of 50007 and 50049 into GB Railfreight blue and orange in 2019 has catapulted the class to a new level of enthusiast attention.

The two locomotives were placed on loan with GBRf in January 2019 by the Class 50 Alliance Preservation Group and are regularly used for new train deliveries, rolling stock movements and railtour duties. They were repainted at Eastleigh Works and unveiled in the new colour scheme in March 2019 when 50007 was turned out with dual identities -50007 Hercules on one side and 50014 Warspite on the other.

Hornby announced its plan for ready-to-run 'OO' gauge versions of 50007 Hercules/50014 Warspite and 50049 Defiance in its 2020 catalogue and we, like many others, have been eagerly

looking forward to their arrival. The two versions touched down in December and were selling fast through Hornby's stockists at the end of 2020. Both are delivered DCC ready with an 8-pin decoder and directional lighting as standard while the accessory pack differs between the two locomotives in that 50049 has the option to add three-part miniature snowploughs to the model. Externally, the two Class 50s

look superb with separately fitted handrails, windscreen wipers, multiple working cables, opening cab doors and movable side grilles, although we'd venture to say that the blue is a shade lighter than the real engines. Nevertheless, paint application and printing of the

HORNBY SIX-WHEEL

ORNBY is jumping into 2021 with immediate delivery of its new collection of four and six-wheel carriages for 'OO' gauge, with a first sample arriving in the Hornby Magazine office just in time to make it into the review pages.

The new collection of carriages offers a assortment of four fourwheel and four six-wheel carriage designs with or without interior lighting. Livery choices include Great Northern Railway teak, Great Western Railway chocolate and cream, London, Brighton and South Coast Railway crimson, London North Western Railway 'plum and spilt milk', London North Eastern Railway teak and - as per our sample - BR crimson and others.

Our sample reflects a six-wheel Brake Third which features three passenger compartments and a guard's compartment with end windows - and it has lights too. These highlight the interior detail and showcase the planked floor in the guard's compartment together with the handbrake while the seating shape of the passenger compartments is also clear to see.

The Brake Third is neatly detailed with panel lines, guard's ducket at

the rear, turned metal buffers, full length step boards, battery boxes and roof vents. In addition, there are turned metal carriage wheels - the centre axle floats side to side to allow it to negotiate second radius curves - while there are NEM coupling pockets with small tension locks at each end of the carriage.

Completing the package is the lighting system. This is battery powered with a reed sensor which allows the supplied magnet to be 'waved' over the carriage roof to turn the lights on and off to give characteristic warm white lighting to the interior. It's very effective and the use of battery power reduces the impact of pick up drag on the wheels to make these coaches free running vehicles. When you receive the carriages with lights you will need to remove a paper tab from the chassis to connect the battery to the lighting circuit.

These new carriages are hot off the press and the full range is due for delivery progressively from January to the Hornby retailer network. Excellent additions which are ready to roll this month. (MW)

When a train with a powered vehicle (a locomotive or carriage/wagon with lights) enters the section which the wire is connected to, the detector senses the load through the wire and

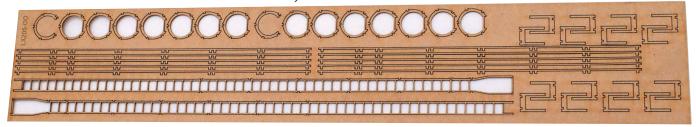

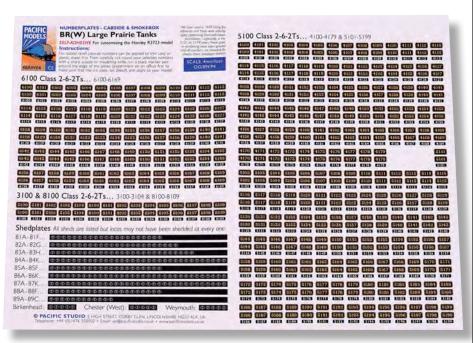

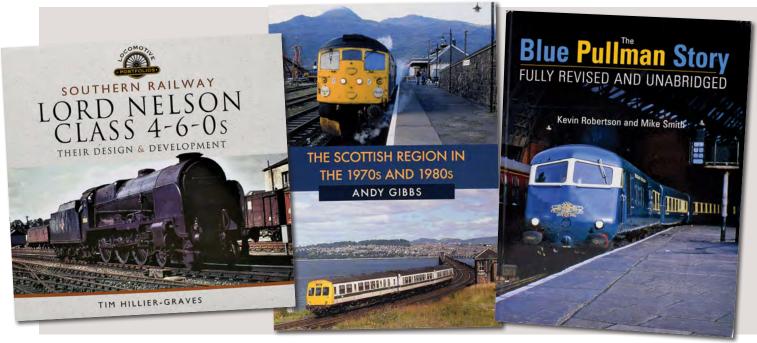

while they performed well, they did not quite live up to expectations.

The book covers the evolution of the 4-6-0 design and its subsequent adoption for the class with easy-to-follow text, while further chapters include diagrams and photographs of the various stages of construction, tender design and more, plus the full production programme, Bulleid's influence and the final years. A history of some class members is also included with depot allocations, miles covered, liveries carried, modifications, boiler and tender details and more.

Illustrated throughout with a wealth of mainly black and white images of the locomotives during development and in service through the years, it also features invaluable detail shots such as locomotive head signal positioning and headboard placement. The book also captures the class' final days, the occasional accident and concludes with a focus on 'Lord Nelson' 852/30852 Sir Walter Raleigh and the extensive damage it received during the Blitz on London in 1941, following a direct hit at Nine Elms depot. Happily, it was subsequently rebuilt.

This latest release in Pen and Sword's Locomotive Portfolios series is a thoroughly enjoyable and informative read and a very useful reference tool for modellers wishing to reflect a particular 'Lord Nelson' 4-6-0 and period in its career. (MC)

S the title suggests, this latest picture volume from Andy Gibbs focuses on British Rail's Scottish Region traction in the 1970s and 1980s. It was a period when diesel and electric locomotives provided the lion's share of motive power for passenger workings, ably assisted by Diesel Multiple Units (DMUs) and Electric Multiple Units (EMUs) where services demanded.

Locations from the Scottish borders to the Far North Line are included, providing a wealth of nostalgic images from the period of main line and secondary passenger services in the landscape, together with freight workings. For those wishing to replicate many of the typically shorter Scottish Region train formations in miniature, images are sharp and nicely reproduced enabling clear recognition of much of the stock used.

In addition, locomotive activity at main line stations including Aberdeen, Edinburgh Waverley, Glasgow Central, Glasgow Queen Street and Inverness is captured, as is shunting, such as at Perth at the time. The changing livery scene is also reflected with the splashes of colour as the transition from BR's corporate blue to Large Logo, InterCity 'Executive', ScotRail blue-stripe, Strathclyde Passenger Transport Executive (PTE) orange and grey, Sealink livery and more took hold.

As with previous Amberley Publishing volumes from the author, this latest title includes plenty of pictorial delights and acts as a nostalgic reminder of locomotive haulage in Scotland during the 1970s and 1980s and will no doubt serve as valuable inspiration for modellers wishing to recreate the period in model form. EW from Crecy Publishing is this fully revised history of the eyecatching Metropolitan Cammell Midland Pullman/Western Pullman Diesel Electric Multiple Units (DEMUs).

This latest volume runs to a forensic level of detail within its 392 pages with revised narrative, many previously unseen images and even includes reference to the recent repaint of a former InterCity 125 High Speed Train set in Midland Pullman Nanking blue and white livery.

Chapters cover the concept and design, testing, publicity, introduction to service, catering and much more. The construction of each vehicle is covered in detail and illustrated with copious images and diagrams. This sets the scene for the rest of the book as a great deal of detail is incorporated within each chapter and lavishly illustrated throughout, offering a tantalising glimpse of the onboard experience as Pullman stewards in their crisp white jackets silver-served guests at their seats. Further behind-the-scenes photographs provide a view of every aspect of the train's operation including kitchen layout, luggage compartments, driver's cabs, engine room compartments – even the lavatories.

As you might expect, there are also plenty of in-service images of the units in action in their original Nanking blue and white livery, revised warning panel variations and the later reversed Pullman grey and blue livery, as carried during their tenure on the Western Region. Some lesser-known examples of units in mixed liveries and even short empty workings and covered too.

This is a superb document of the highs and lows of these outstanding and distinctive trains, with many previously unseen images. First Class in every sense. (MC)

HIS new pictorial album from Key Books offers a fascinating insight into the transition from BR green to the new BR blue corporate scheme and aims to include the major changes along the way such as small yellow warning panels, full yellow ends and more. Indeed, despite the desire to move to a new corporate scheme, there were still a few anomalies in service into the mid-1970s, with the BR green colour scheme still in evidence in some quarters - making a change of corporate identity never happens overnight.

Just some of the standout photographs include BR Class 25 25218 retaining faded BR green with full yellow ends in 1974 and BR Class 20 20075 in worn BR green with coaching stock roundels in 1976.

Conversely, some locomotives due to be withdrawn in the late 1960s appear to have received BR blue late in their lives such as D600 'Warship' A1A-A1As including D602 in BR blue with small yellow warning panels and D600 in BR blue with full yellow ends in 1967, despite imminent withdrawal later that year.

This sets the scene for the book which features a super selection of diesel and electric locomotives in various takes on BR green, BR maroon and BR blue liveries, while coaching stock and multiple units are also featured within the pages too to illustrating the changing livery scene, with examples including a Gresley buffet car in BR blue/grey and even a BR Mk 1 Corridor Brake Second (BSK) surviving in chocolate and cream at the head of blue/grey stock, hauled by a BR two-tone green Brush Type 4 in 1968.

With more than 160 colour photographs, it serves as a useful reference of this colourful period in British Rail's history which will assist modellers in recreating the period. (MC)

volume from Craig Munday highlighting the Cornish Main Line between St Austell and Penzance.

Picking up where the previous pictorial album left off (HM161), our journey heads west and covers mainline and branch line activity with a good deal of passenger and freight services included from the early 1970s through to the present day. Existing passenger and freight-only branch lines in the Duchy are covered, together with the line to Hayle Wharves which lasted until the 1980s.

While freight flows today are much reduced and passenger services are mainly in the hands of multiple units, the Cornish Main Line remains remarkably busy with an improved passenger timetable. The author has included a superb selection of photographs charting passenger and freight highlights through the years with many capturing the stunning landscape as well as the all-important subject matter. Captions are well-written, informative and include suggestions for the right time of year to capture certain locations at their best.

For railway modellers, the outstanding collection of photographs of infrastructure and track layouts will be perfect for researching specific locations, while the clear image reproduction will help those wishing to recreate some of the passenger and train formations in miniature form. Factor in impressive viaducts, stunning scenery, and a superb selection of motive power within west Cornwall through the years and the result is another outstanding volume. 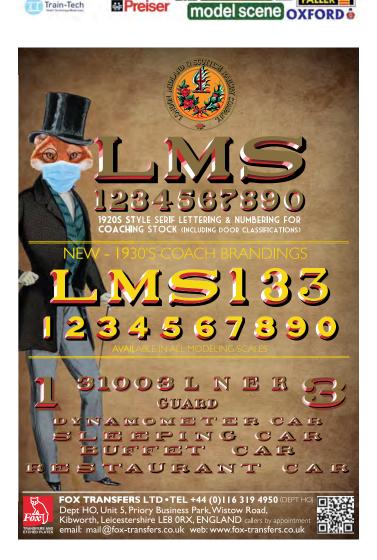

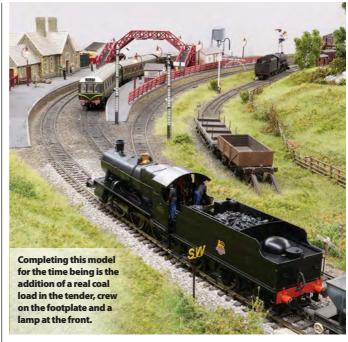

T'S NOT THAT LONG AGO THAT sound was an afterthought for ready-to-run locomotives, but recent releases have been following a trend to make the process simpler for modellers. Each manufacturer has its own outlook on how to achieve this, with Dapol's new 'OO' gauge GWR 'Mogul' being amongst those to put digital and sound installation high on the list of priorities for locomotive design.

The advantage is that Dapol has considered how the model will be used from the start of the design process. Provision has been made for two speakers, wiring is provided from the factory to connect these to the decoder and, moreover, access to the decoder socket is straightforward too. These considerations combined with a new no-wire power coupling between the locomotive and tender make this a very user-friendly locomotive, as we will show here.

When it comes to installing sound there are two choices with the 'Mogul'. You can go for the completely tool-free route by adding a 15mm x 11mm cube speaker and Next18 sound decoder inside the smokebox or, if you want the very best from the sound file, you can add a speaker in the tender as well for enhanced audio. Adding the second speaker requires a small crosshead screwdriver

and the use of a soldering iron in order to connect the speaker to the pre-fitted wires in the tender.

Even so, it is a straightforward process throughout and there is no cutting, drilling or modification required to introduce a twin speaker set up to the Dapol 'Mogul'.

Our project uses Digitrains' ZS012P GWR two-cylinder sound file loaded onto a ZIMO MX659N18 sound decoder. The Next18 plug and socket is very neat and saves space too. The decoder is highly capable and features 23 functions including live volume control through F27 and F28 (avoiding the need to use CV programming to adjust the locomotive's volume) as well as the F2 Active Brakes and F5 heavy/light engine sound sets which are hallmarks of the Proto and Active Drive sound decoder profiles sold by Digitrains.

To complete our 'Mogul' project – at least until it is weathered anyway - we added a Modelu GWR crew and lamp using the manufacturer's new locomotive crew pack (HM162) as well as a crushed coal load in the tender to improve its appearance. 6324 is now ready for service with sound to match its super-detailed exterior.

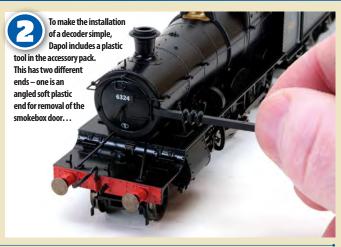

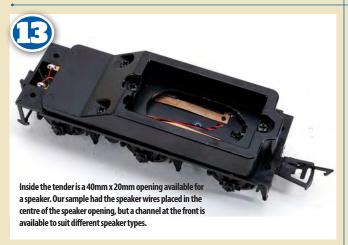
The smokebox installation process is clean, neat and tidy and fills the space available. However, the '43'X' has space for a second speaker in the tender too expanding the performance of the sound decoder. Adding a second speaker is optional - the sound will play through the 15mm x 11mm cube speaker on its own if you prefer.

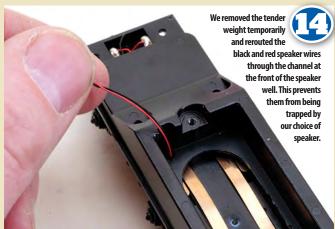






To access the tender interior, there are four crosshead screws – one at each corner of the tender chassis. Remove all four and keep them safe for reassembly.

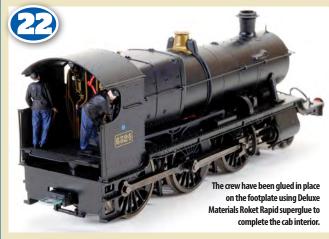

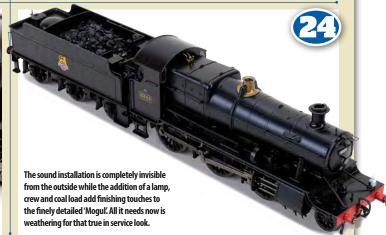

It is often overlooked that digital sounds are only as good as the weakest link in the audio chain. In many cases, that comes down to the last component before the sound waves actually hit your ears - the loudspeaker.

We have seen many good sound projects let down by bad speaker choice or poor installation. Most readily-offered or pre-installed model railway speakers are of low quality or severely limited frequency range for simple reasons of cost. But don't get disillusioned, help is now at hand...

the introduction of miniaturised devices for smartphones, tablets and laptops. The railway modeller can now piggy-back on this research and development, reaping the reward of much better audio quality from such small spaces.

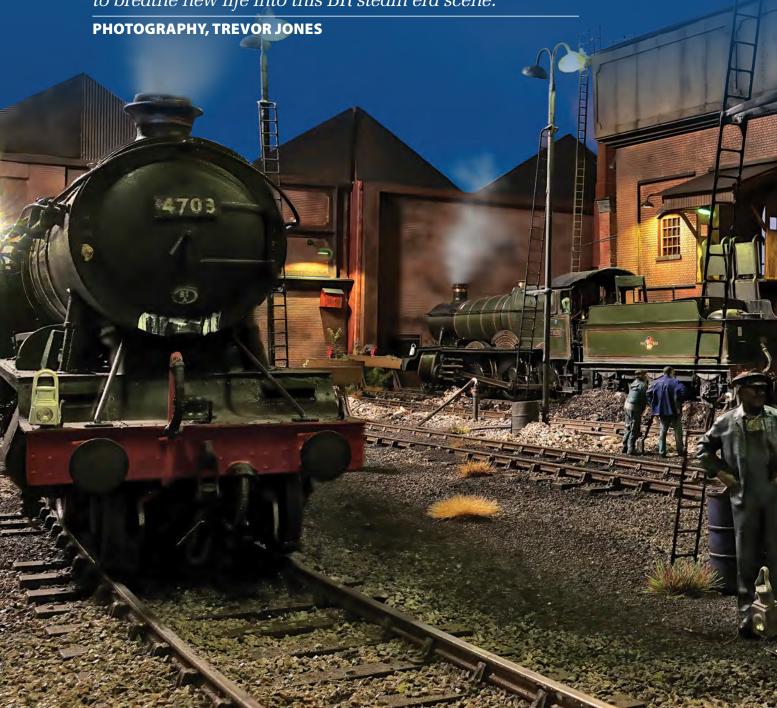

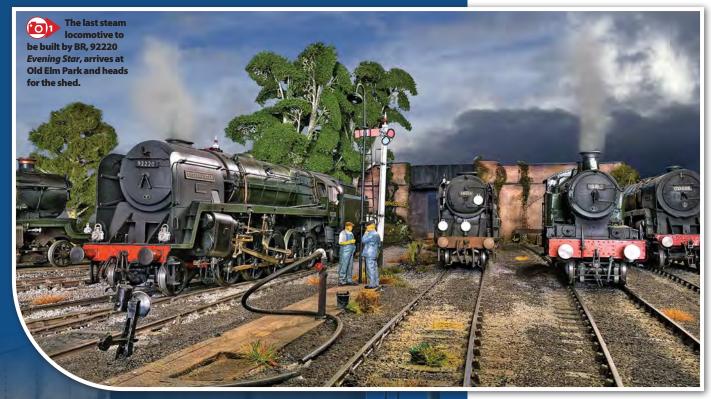

Having built a stunning 'O' gauge roundhouse to display his locomotives, MARK POLLARD created an extension to breathe new life into this BR steam era scene.





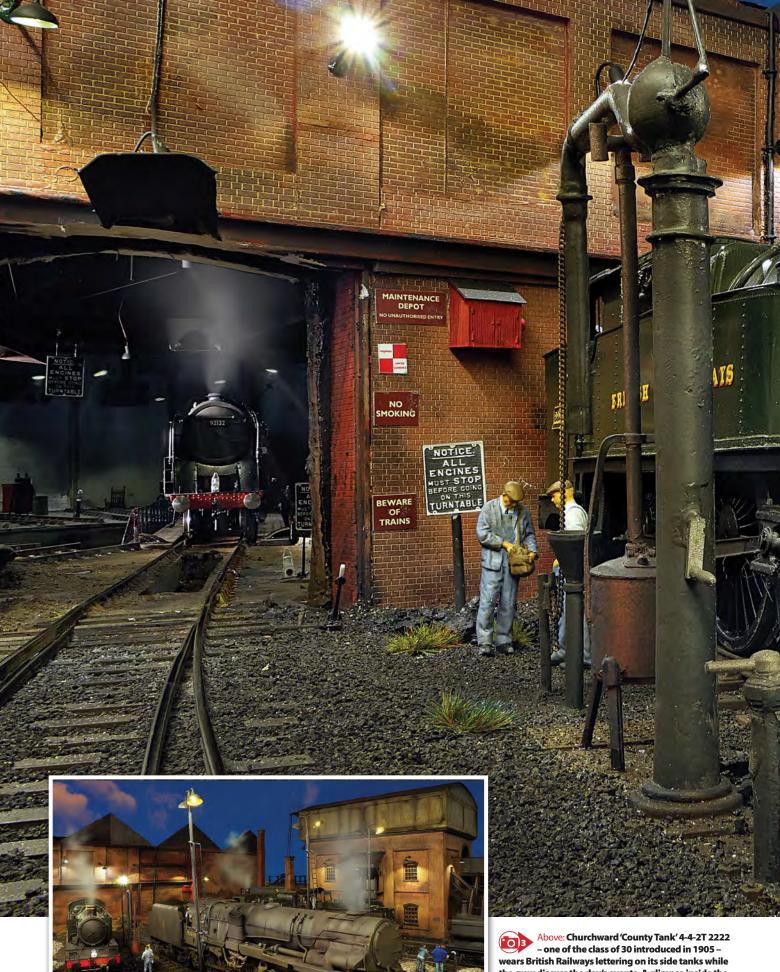
LD ELM PARK STARTED off with the idea to build the inside of a roundhouse and create a minimum space 'O' gauge diorama layout. Measuring just 4ft x 4ft the roundhouse appeared in HM141 and at the Great Electric Train Show in October 2019 at the Marshall Arena in Milton Keynes.

The model gives the impression that you are standing in the shed looking through the smoke at the locomotives resting between their duties. I have added a smoke generator since the last article which adds to the effect; the only thing I have not been able to recreate is the smell, and its compact design with locomotives shuffling in and out and turning on the turntable has attracted great attention at model railway exhibitions.

As a keen locomotive builder, I wanted to create a scene to display my models and the roundhouse scene offered the perfect backdrop. I have always enjoyed visits to Didcot and a couple of years ago the Great Western Society magazine arrived with a superb image from inside Old Oak Common. At the time, I was considering construction of the roundhouse section of this layout, but it was that single image which really inspired me to go and build it.

The roundhouse is a 4ft x 4ft box with the turntable a quarter of the way back with 24 lines off it. The front roads are cut short to give the impression that you are inside the building adding further to its atmosphere. It's also positioned around eye level so that onlookers at exhibitions>>>

wears British Railways lettering on its side tanks while the crew discuss the day's events. A glimpse inside the shed reveals a '9F' about to leave the turntable.

look straight into the roundhouse at eye level and framed with a fascia to give the impression of a moving picture. There are LED lights hanging from the roof and lots of details like buckets, tools, barrows, headboards lying around and also members of staff going about their duties (except the one lying in the wheel barrow if you can spot him).

For those who missed the first article,

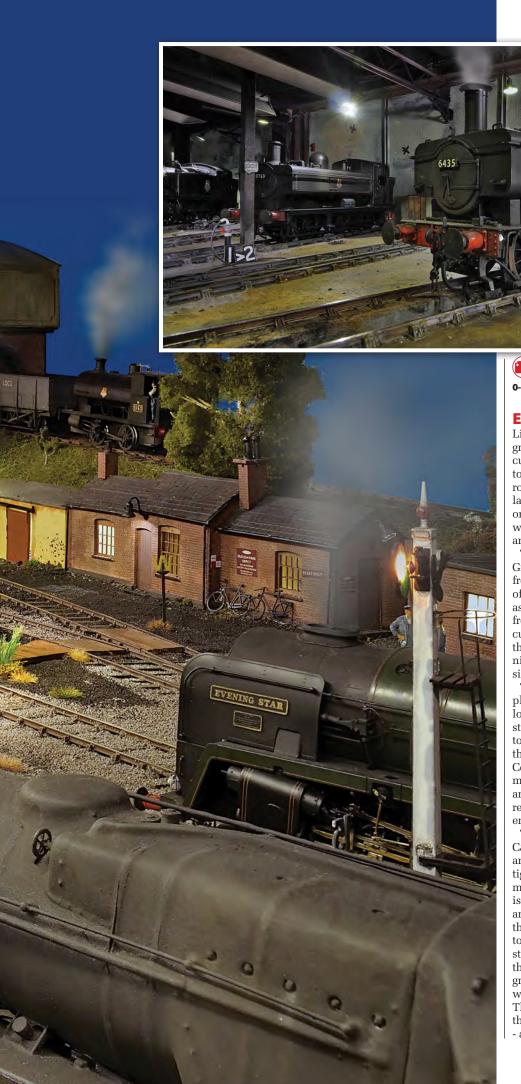
the shed is based on an imaginary location in the Reading area, hence the name - a mix of Old Oak Common and Elm Park, Reading football club's old ground. The location gives the option to have locomotives on shed from the Southern Region coming up from Guildford or the Basingstoke line, Western Region and the odd Midland Region locomotive on an inter-regional working. You can also

see the Eastern Region locomotives from railtours or football specials. This means there is a large variety of locomotives visiting the yard and shed for water, coal, minor repairs and attention — and handily this also suits my own varied collection of 'O' gauge models. Other services are supplies for the shed and the local breakdown train, inspector's saloon and a short engineering train.》

The yard is busy with BR Standards, a Bulleid 'Pacific' and GWR locomotives as the night draws in. The lighting from the yard lamps and buildings adds greatly to the atmosphere of the scene.

EXPANSION PLAN

N. Allen

Like so many modelling projects, this grew! A hole to the outside world was cut in the shed wall for a 'storage yard' to help get locomotives in and out of the roundhouse. This was the format the layout was displayed last year. To expand on the design a yard has now been built where locomotives are watered, coaled and serviced before going on and off shed.

The main building in the yard is a large Great Western Railway coaling stage built from a Timbertracks kit. The outside wall of Old Elm Park shed is scratchbuilt, as are other structures except the bothy from one of the excellent Intentio laser cut wood kit range. There are LED lights throughout the yard which add to the night scene and a couple of working signals to further embellish the scene.

The baseboards are made from plywood, and the layout is now 14ft long including the shed and a traverser storage yard which allows locomotives to move in and out of the yard to follow the servicing process of a steam depot. Control is by a Lenz DCC system and many locomotives are sound fitted and kit built by me - except for a few ready to run examples which have entered the market in recent years.

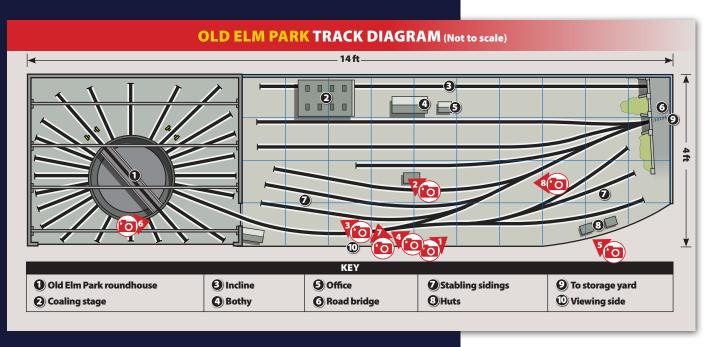
Track work is a mixture of Marcway and C&L finescale. The layout is on a curve and the front line has a radius of 12ft. The tightest radius is 6ft so even the largest models can reach all parts of the layout. It is mainly ballasted with 'N' gauge cinders and ballast along with some real ash from the log burner and real coal crushed up to recreate the typical ground cover of a steam shed. The foliage is mainly from the Woodland Scenics range, and the grass is the first attempt at static grass which I think has turned out acceptably. There are many detail parts - some like the fire iron rack built from scrap brass - and the boardwalk from scrap timber.>>>

OPERATION

Arrivals at Old Elm Park enter the yard and pass through a three-way point leading into the curved track pattern. To the right is the coaling stage while to the left (at the front of the layout) is a series of three stabling sidings where locomotives and rolling stock are held between duties. There are more sidings adjacent to the coaling stage, all of which have the roundhouse exterior as their backdrop.

Once at the shed locomotives move to the coaling line for fresh coal and water before moving back across the yard to take their place in either the stabling sidings or inside the roundhouse where they use the turntable for access to the inside tracks for maintenance.

The variety of locomotives available to Old Elm Park continues to expand with the majority on shed for this photoshoot being of Great Western and Southern Railway origins. Highlights include a BR lined blue GWR 'King' 4-6-0 as 6006 King George I, a GWR '47XX' 2-8-0 finished as 4703, one of Dapol's new GWR '14XX' 0-4-2Ts as 1444 in BR lined green with a weathered finished plus last built BR '9F' 2-10-0 92220 Evening Star in its unique (for the class) BR lined green livery.

For added variety the coaling line is separately operated from the main yard allowing coal wagons to be propelled up the incline to deliver fresh fuel to the coal stage.

STEAM ATMOSPHERE

Old Elm Park has been an exercise in recreating the atmosphere of the steam operated railway and has given me great pleasure to build and develop. The new yard serves to expand the operational value of Old Elm Park and I'm looking forward to being able to take the layout back out to events in the future.

For now I hope you enjoy the photographs and if it gives you the impression of standing in a busy yard taking in the atmosphere and watching the comings and goings then I have succeeded in my aims.

Much policy many EVAN review

Much has been written about British Railways' post-war traction policy and in particular its decision to continue constructing what many regarded as obsolete and outdated steam engines.

EVAN GREEN-HUGHES looks again at the dilemma BR faced and reviews whether, with hindsight, it came to the right decision.

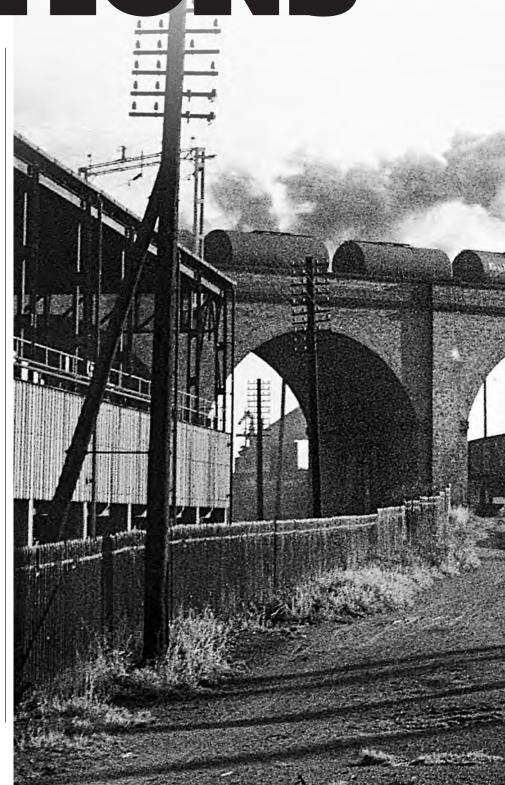
TRACTION OPTIONS

HILE STEAM locomotives were the dominant traction in the newly-nationalised British Railways, the company also had an array of potential replacements. These included electric propulsion, gas turbines, diesel engines and even completely rethought external combustion engines such as Bulleid's 'Leader' class.

The search for a replacement had been under way for almost half a century with the basic issue to tackle being one of the relative inefficiency of the steam engine, particularly when coupled with its limited availability and heavy manpower requirements. Balanced against this was the fact that the fuel source for the steam engine, coal, was very easy to obtain, steam engines were relatively cheap to construct and maintain and did not require a highly-trained workforce to operate them or keep them running.

Electrification had begun as early as 1909 with the celebrated South London line between Victoria and Peckham Rye and soon spread widely to other suburban services, particularly in the south of England, the North East and in Lancashire. Electric trains enabled the railways to compete with the clean and direct electric tramcars, but also saved manning costs as only one person was required on the footplate. These trains were also available for a higher proportion of the day than steam and were cheaper to run, as long as traffic was sufficiently regular to pay for the cost of the necessary power-supplying infrastructure.

The greatest proponent of electrification had been the Southern Railway which already had a great deal of its system equipped with the third-rail system by nationalisation in 1948 - but other companies had successfully dabbled with electric trains, in particular the North Eastern Railway, which had some electrified freight services in the area around Shildon and which at »

one time had planned to electrify the East Coast Main Line north of York.

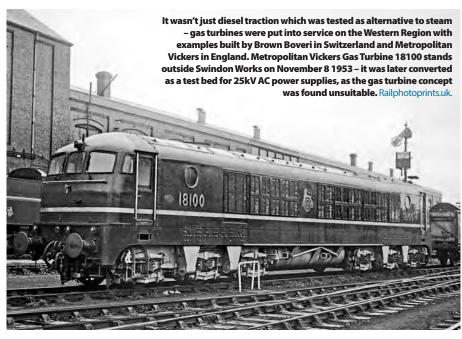
At the time of nationalisation, electrification of the former London and North Eastern Railway's Manchester-Sheffield-Wath route was well underway, although progress had been badly hampered by the war. This was being equipped with the 1,500v DC overhead system, which had found much favour in mainland Europe, and it was thought that this would be the prototype for electrification of much of the UK's main line system. Unfortunately, while the 1,500v DC system worked very well, it required heavy catenary to supply the power to the trains, and the electrical sub-stations had to be close together, all of which increased the capital cost. In the cash-strapped post-war years it was obvious that the sort of money required for widespread electrification was not going to be forthcoming, so another way forward had to be found.

INTERNAL COMBUSTION

The London Midland & Scottish and Southern Railway had commissioned viable main line diesel locomotives in the 1940s, with one of these actually being completed before nationalisation, but internal combustion engines had been around for many years before that. The North Eastern had had its petrol-electric railcars in the early years of the century and the Great Western made a success of its railcars in the 1930s and 1940s, while most companies had taken advantage of low-powered shunting engines, the use of which had become widespread since the 1930s.

Diesels, however, were not very fully developed in the late 1940s, the biggest problem being the available power to weight ratio which arose due to the relatively low power outputs of the diesel engines of the time.

The LMS 'twins' and the Southern's equivalents had power units that were only rated at around 1,750hp, which when put into steam terms put them a little bit below what was available from a steam mixed traffic 4-6-0 in top form (although the diesels



were generally able to deploy that power for longer). Trials proved that for most express work diesels had to be worked in pairs and only then did they become the equivalent of a modern 'Pacific'. With construction costs vastly more for diesel locomotives than for steam and with more locomotives needed to perform the same work, the economic advantages were not as great as they should have been for long-distance expresses and heavy freights and this, when coupled with the necessity to use expensive imported oil as a fuel instead of home-dug coal, swung the balance in favour of steam.

THE 'JET TRAINS'

The matter of low-powered engines was also to have great relevance with regard to trains intended for short-distance work. While the GWR had had much success with its streamlined railcars, the 125hp engines fitted could not match the stop-start performance of equivalent steam engines. In addition, after the war there was a shortage of suitable power units as everything that was being built was being diverted to

road vehicles, and in particular buses.

Recognising the issue of power versus weight the Great Western's last Chief Mechanical engineer, F.W. Hawksworth, had shown great interest in the work of Brown-Boveri of Baden in Switzerland which was developing gas turbines for use in the rail industry. Experimental work with a prototype in Europe had shown that a turbine could produce 2,200hp, driving the wheels through electric transmission, while development work was also under way on a turbine that would deliver 4,000hp.

The GWR ordered an experimental locomotive of its own, with this arriving after nationalisation and being numbered 18000. It is fair to say that there was little enthusiasm for this locomotive from British Railways and it did spend a lot of time out of service with various mechanical faults. One of the biggest issues was that gas turbines are at their best when running at a constant load but do not react well when spending a lot of time idling or in the typical rail operation of alternating high and low power demands. They are also high consumers of

fuel, which again the authorities would have had to import at a time when the balance of payments situation was very dire.

Nevertheless, the performance of the GW turbine was good enough that a second one was ordered, this time built in the UK, and which was to be rated at no less than 3,000hp. This came from Metropolitan Vickers, a company that had also been involved with the steam turbine fitted to the LMS's steam turbine 6202 of the 'Princess Royal' class. With the new Metropolitan Vickers locomotive, 18100, the emphasis had been on power output and as a result fuel consumption was very high, with aviation grade fuel being specified, which was much more expensive than the heavy oil used on 18000.

Within a short space of time BR, was able to come up with some comparative costs which showed that a typical ex-GWR 4-6-0 such as a 'Castle' would cost around 21d a mile to run, while the LMS diesels cost around the same. The Swiss gas turbine cost about 19d per mile while the British-built one cost a whopping 50d per mile, more than twice as much any of its competitors. It was felt that, compared with steam, the better efficiency of the diesel was outweighed by its increased construction cost while there was little interest in the gas turbine, which had not proved entirely satisfactory in service but might have warranted further development.

The same fate befell all of the innovative improvements being applied to steam engines, with the result that the BR Standard steam engines were very much a traditional product, with little

in the way of technological advances.

However, one other factor that might have had some bearing on the choice was that BR itself was only really set up for steam locomotive construction, and that to go for any other form of traction would have involved potentially taking work away from the state-owned industry's workshops and placing it in the private sector.

THE RIGHT CALL?

So, was British Railways right to continue with the production of steam engines, and in turn produce the standard classes, many of which had a scandalously short life? The answer probably is yes, given the information and facilities that were available in 1948.

BR's chief mechanical engineer, Robert Riddles, believed that a new generation of steam locomotives could 'hold the fort' until widespread electrification was possible with diesels running on those routes it was not viable to wire. What those making that decision could not have fully anticipated would be the developments in other forms of traction over the next few years. The cost of providing electrified railways was to be revolutionised by the introduction of the 25kv AC system, which vastly reduced the cost of the overhead equipment and allowed lineside facilities such as sub-stations to be sited much further apart. As far as diesels were concerned, power unit developments over the following decade brought with them the possibility of locomotives that could develop 2,750hp, or even 3,300hp in the case of the 'Deltics', while new construction techniques allowed the

development of load-bearing structures that would do away with the heavy underframes that were necessary on early diesels, further improving power to weight ratios. Local trains were also revolutionised by the development of 150-230hp engines that allowed viable diesel multiple units to be introduced in their thousands. No serious development took place with gas turbines and so there were no real advances in this area and as a result this type of locomotive found only limited use in the world.

Once it became apparent, only a few years later, that technological advances had tipped the balance away from steam, the matter was considered again and this time steam lost out, leading to BR's Modernisation Plan, the widespread introduction of diesels, the spread of main line electrification and the early demise of some relatively modern steam engines.

Had some of these developments come a few years earlier it is likely that BR might never have built its standard steam engines, but today, given the information we now know, it would be hard to criticise those who did authorise them. That diesels were later chosen over steam and also competitors such as gas turbines was as a result of improved technology, which by that time had left its rivals far behind. Electrification, meanwhile, continues slowly - despite being by far the cheapest and cleanest way of operating trains. However, with stiff decarbonisation targets for the rail industry, it is likely that ultimately, Riddles' ambition will be achieved, although with battery and fuel cell trains covering the routes which can't viably be electrified.

BUILDING BRIDGES





Recent stock changes on Topley Dale have reminded Mike that he really needs to break out the airbrush and add weathering to the latest additions to his fleet.

Richard is itching to continue construction of the magazine's new Great Central Railway theme 'OO' gauge layout project in the New Year.

Topley Dale has gained a third bridge scene with a new four-arch low height viaduct being built for the diversion route. **MIKE WILD** explains how it was assembled using the popular Wills kit.

HE DESIGN FOR TOPLEY Dale's diversion route features a road under the railway and I wanted a waterway to pass under the line too to create that sense of the railway cutting through a rolling landscape. Those two elements combined meant bridges were required to allow the railway to cross both in a realistic manner.

When I started on the project I had always envisaged two separate bridges - one for the road and one for the waterway - but on measuring up the scene it soon became apparent that the original vision wasn't going to work as I had hoped. The separate structures meant replicating the style of the road over bridge nearby or a structure type which just wasn't suited to its purpose or the style of the area.

Having considered everything, tested a couple of different ideas against the trackbed and thought a little further there was an obvious route forward - a third Wills viaduct to carry the railway over the new lower level features. The layout already has two Wills viaducts which will be well known to regular readers. The first was built to carry the railway over a river on the exit from the tunnel while the second provides a scenic break as a road over bridge at the centre of the main scenic run. Both of these were built as the kit instructions intended as three-arch structures with tall supports, but the new location of the diversion route allowed for a longer bridge. Happily, Wills produces an Extra Arch kit for the viaduct so that it can be expanded to any length.

The area available provided enough room for a four-arch viaduct, but this time its piers would be much lower at just 20mm from the baseboard surface to the base of the arches. This would give the new viaduct a considerably different appearance to the original structures from Topley Dale while maintaining a consistency in its style.

The kit is straightforward to build on the whole with the only tricky part being adding the curved brick inlays for the arch tops. These need patience and careful cleaning up to ensure they fit correctly, as they also go in under

tension. My solution to reduce the tension during assembly was to score the back of each brick panel every 5mm to introduce a greater degree of flexibility into the sheets.

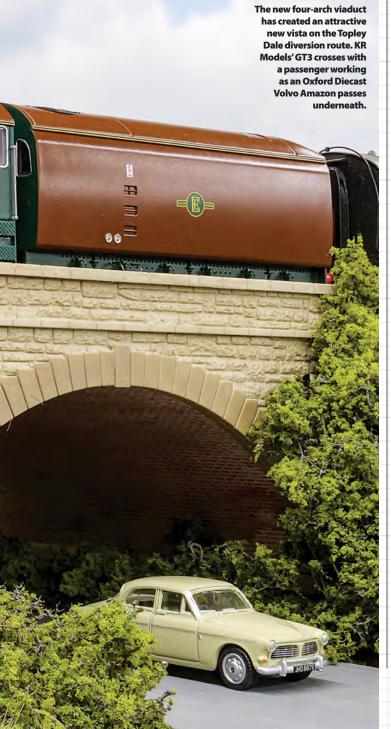
Only basic tools are required to build this kit - a craft knife, steel ruler, Deluxe Materials Plastic Magic liquid cement and a sanding board; one of Albion Hobbies coarse grade boards in this case. The process starts by building up each of the arches and we also used the supplied bridge deck in this project too. Once each arch had been assembled the brick inlay was slotted into place and the sections were then joined together to create the basis of the four arch structure.

Next the mounts for the supports were glued in place followed by the piers themselves which were cut down from the supplied sheets to the required 20mm height to suit the location of the viaduct.

To finish the model a mortar course was added to the brick sheeting using watered down Woodland Scenics concrete coloured paint. This flows neatly into the embossed brick sheeting while also toning down the brick red plastic colouring of the sheets. The main colour for the stonework is Humbrol 187 which was dry brushed over the structure as well as being painted on to the key stones around each arch opening.

The baseboard surface from the diversion was cut away to allow the new bridge to be inserted and the track was reinstated by gluing down the cork track underlay using multi-purpose adhesive onto which the track was glued using the same medium. Finally the track was ballasted making way for trains to run across the new structure.

There are still finishing jobs to complete around the bridge, including the waterway and backdrop, while I'd like to add more depth to the stonework of the bridge with weathering. Nevertheless, the diversion route scenery is coming along nicely now and you can watch more of our latest steps to add the Faller Car System to this area in our Hornby Magazine Show from December 24 which is ready to watch at www.keymodelworld.com/ online-exclusives now along with previous video updates. 🎹 📆

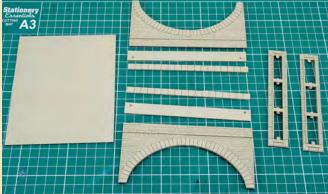


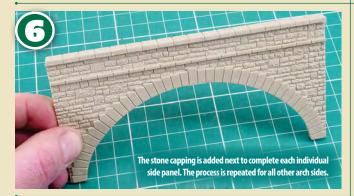
STEP BY STEP BUILDING A WILLS VIADUCT IN 'OO' GAUGE



The starting point for the project is a Wills three-arch bridge kit and an extra arch. All you need to build the viaduct is a cutting mat, craft knife, plastic cement (Deluxe Materials Plastic Magic in our case), a steel ruler and a sanding board.

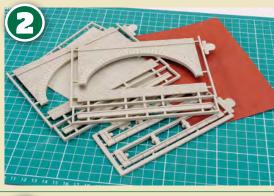






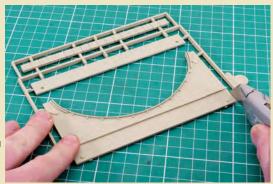


side has now been added setting the section up for the addition of the brick arch inlay.



The parts come pre-moulded in suitable colours, but final painting will embellish this at the end of the project. The main stone parts are on sprues while the thinner flexible brick sheets are separate.

To assist the brick sheets in following the shape of the arch we scored the back of each sheet lightly every 5mm to add to its flexibility which made feeding it into the arch a little easier.

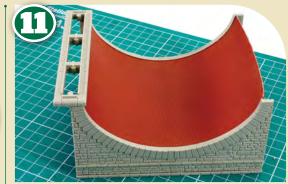




Guides are positioned around the arch for the brick inlay sheet to follow. This is the trickiest part of the build. We have added one set of pier supports to this section as it will be at one end of the bridge.

Our top tip for this stage of the viaduct is to take your time - that will be rewarded with a successful build and neat inner arches.



Once the brick inlay has been added the brick arch feels strong. These steps now need to be repeated forthe remaining sections to assemble all the arches.



were then bonded together with the same plastic cement to create a single piece structure ready for the next stage. It is important to allow the glue to cure fully before moving onto the next step.

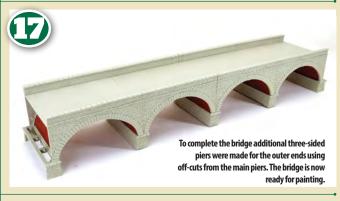
Materials Plastic Magic was used again to join the supports to the arches. The result is that the support sections hold the brick inlays in the correct position.

The piers supplied with the kit are much taller than we needed for our chosen location. Each sheet and side panel was cut down to create 20mm tall supports for the bridge. This height brings the finished bridge to the same level as the trackbed.





WHAT WE USED



Painting started with a wash of Woodland Scenics Concrete (ST1454) which was thinned with water to allow it to flow into the bricks. The stonework was then dry brushed with Humbrol 187 to give it a natural look. Weathering will follow in the future.

The pictures show an IRDOT-1 infra red detector. This is used for locating trains in hidden sidings and fiddleyards. The IRDOT board fits beneath the baseboard with the infra red detector and emitter (black "tubes" shown in the right hand picture) fitting in a hole between the sleepers. The infra red beam is reflected from the underside of (unmodified) rolling stock.



When a train is detected the LED lights. It is easy to locate the LED on the control panel with 2 wires from the screw terminals on the left of the board. IRDOT boards are powered from 12 to 16 volts AC or DC. A range of IRDOTs with relays and switch off delays are also available.
