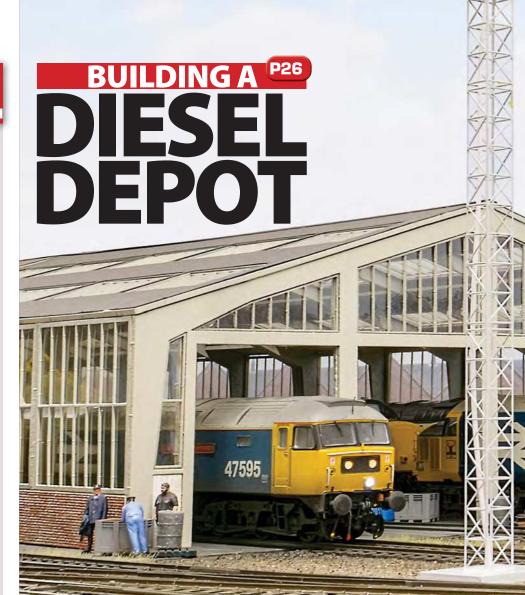

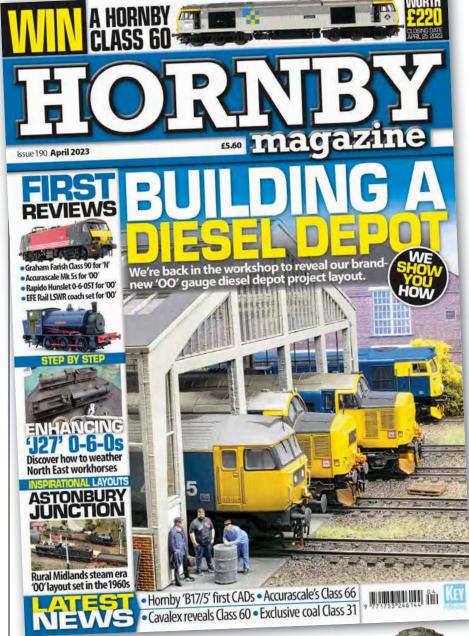

Announced in January as part of the 2023 Hornby catalogue announcements, newly-tooled models are planned of the two distinctive streamlined 4-6-0s converted from conventional

locomotives in 1937. They were employed on the Great Eastern section, primarily for use on 'The East Anglian' express between London Liverpool Street and Norwich. Both were rebuilt as 'B17/6' 4-6-0s in the late 1940s/early 1950s.

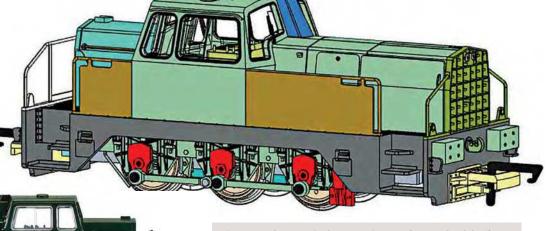

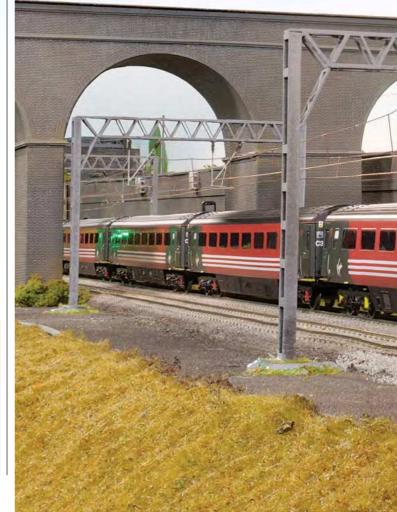

Bachmann unveils

SPRING 2023 RELEASE PLANS

ACHMANN has revealed its Spring 2023 British Railway Announcements with a raft of new model releases across its 'OO', 'N', 'OO9' and 'O' gauge ranges. Highlights of the new release plan include a selection of 'OO' gauge Class 143/144 two-car 'Pacer' Diesel Multiple Units (DMUs) in the EFE Rail range, further new 'OO' gauge Class 37 diesels, a newly-tooled 'OO' gauge MXA 'Lobster' bogie open wagon, the return of the manufacturer's 'OO' gauge Windhoff Multi Purpose Vehicles (MPVs) to the range, an upgraded Digital Command Control (DCC) system and much more.

Bachmann Europe has also unveiled new branding to accompany its new products, in celebration of 190 years of the Bachmann company name.

EFE RAIL

In a surprise move, Bachmann revealed a collection of 'OO' gauge Class 143 and Class 144 'Pacer' Diesel Multiple Units (DMU) to the

EFE Rail range.

Five models are planned with a mix of pristine and weathered finishes appearing as 143622 in BR Tyne and Wear Passenger **Transport Executive livery** (E83025), 143606 in Valley Lines colours (E83026), 143608 in Arriva Trains Wales revised livery with a weathered finish (E83024), 143611 in GWR green with a weathered finish (E83027) and 144011 in weathered Regional Railways livery (E87033). Each model will feature a Next18 DCC decoder socket, directional lighting and interior illumination. Prices are £249.95 for pristine models and £254.95 for weathered examples.

BACHMANN

Bachmann's upgraded 'OO' gauge BR Standard '9F' 2-10-0s with improved chassis and new sound projects are due to be released soon - and the manufacturer has included an additional pair of BR black locomotives to the release schedule. The newly-upgraded models will now incorporate a PluX22 decoder socket and factoryfitted speakers. The new additions will be finished as single-chimney 92090 and 92134 with BR late crests and BR 1G tenders (32861/SF and /32-861A/SF) and will feature a new bespoke single chimney '9F' sound project. A new doublechimney sound project has also

been developed for the previously announced models (HM187). Prices are £229.95 DCC ready and £329.95 DCC sound-fitted.

Bachmann's recently retooled 'OO' gauge Class 37 returns in six new guises this Spring with DCC ready, DCC sound-fitted and DCC sound-fitted deluxe options. The sound-fitted models will include a ZIMO MS450P22 PluX22 sound decoder loaded with one of four bespoke sound projects, according to prototype.

Leading these releases is Series 1 split headcode D6710 in BR green (35-302/SF/SFX), together with Series 2 centre headcode D6829 in BR green with small yelllow panels

(35-306/SF/SFX), 37194 British International Freight Association in Railfreight Distribution livery (35-307/SF/SFX), 37201 *St Margaret* in BR engineers 'Dutch' grey and yellow with centre headcodes and high-intensity headlights (35-308/ SF/SFX), 37414 Cathays C&W Works in Regional Railway colours (35-338/SF/SFX) and 37175 in Colas Rail Freight livery (35-310/SF/SFX). Each model will also incorporate prototypical detail differences ranging from boiler port condition to bogie frame type. Prices are set at £249.95 DCC ready, £349.95 DCC sound-fitted and £379.95 DCC sound-fitted deluxe.

Further additions include Class 158 two-car DMU 158824 in revised Arriva Trains Wales colours (31-511A/SF) priced at £329.95 DCC ready and £429.95 DCC soundfitted, while the manufacturer's long-out-of-production 'OO' gauge Windhoff MPV returns with two versions offered in Network Rail branded orange as DR98964/ DR98914 *Dick Preston* (3X-579/ SF) and in Network Rail branded yellow as DR98923/DR98973 *Chris Lemon* (31-578/SF). The prototypes were amongst a selection of MPVs repainted and named in 2014, which also carried South West Trains branding. As well as DCC ready models, the MPVs will also be available DCC sound-fitted for the first time, priced at £319.95 and £419.95 respectively.

Bachmann has also added a twinpack of BR Mk 2 Tourist Second Open (TSO) carriages in BR ScotRail livery to its rolling stock range to accompany the ScotRail liveried Mk 2 vehicles previously announced. The twin TSO carriage pack is priced £139.95.

Finally for 'OO', Bachmann is developing a newly-tooled model of the MXA 'Lobster' bogie engineers' open wagons converted by DB Cargo. These distinctive wagons utilise former BDA bogie

GRAHAM FARISH

New to Bachmann's Graham Farish range this Spring are 'N' gauge Class 90 90042 in Freightliner Powerhaul livery (371-790/SF), which will be offered in DCC ready and DCC sound fitted formats, priced at £194.95 and £294.95 respectively. Two new 'N' gauge Class 08s are also set to join the collection as 13269 in BR green (371-013A/SF) and 08895 in BR blue (371-015F/SF). These will be to the latest specification with DCC ready and digital sound-fitted options, priced at £149.95 and £249.95.

The range is also set to receive an injection of rolling stock, some of which will be offered with two different running numbers to add variety to formations. The Key Publishing Limited Edition collection is expanding with an exclusive model of Coal Sector liveried Class 31 31276 Calder Hall Power Station with Accurascale for 'OO' gauge.

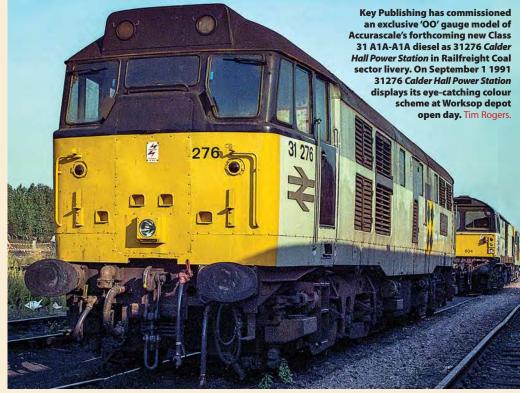
EY PUBLISHING has commissioned an exclusive limited-edition model of one of only two named Coal Sector Class 31s - 31276 Calder Hall Power Station – using the brand-new tooling from Accurascale.

The model of 31276 will be the only triple-grey liveried Class 31 in the first production run and will be available this summer along with the main production batch.

This limited-edition model will be restricted to 150 DCC ready units and 150 DCC sound fitted units. The model will use Accurascale's new tooling for the Brush-built A1A-A1A Class 31s (HM178) which is at the decorated sample stage before progressing to production for release this summer.

The real 31276 was completed at Brush Traction, Loughborough, on July 13 1961 and numbered D5806. It was given Works Number 307 and entered service at Sheffield Darnall shed (41A). It spent the 1960s allocated around the Sheffield area including periods at Tinsley and Wath depots, but moved to the Nottingham Division briefly in 1972 before returning to Tinsley in the same year. Its final allocation was to Thornaby from 1987 until withdrawal on February 11 2000.

31276 was an early repaint into the Railfreight triple grey livery in December 1988 when it also gained Coal sector branding. It was repainted at Vic Berry's and had a black centre door as well as centrally mounted high-intensity lights at the bottom of each cab front. The locomotive carried the Calder Hall Power Station nameplate



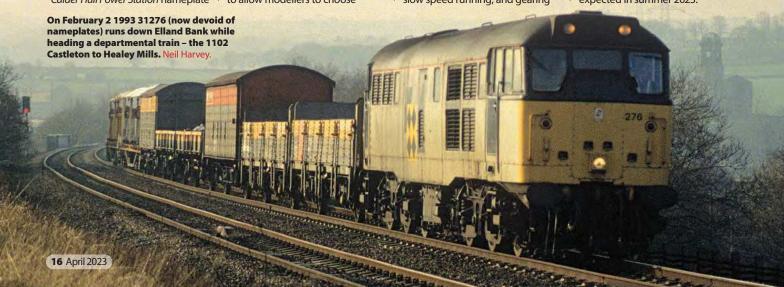
from November 30 1988 until April 30 1992 when the name was transferred to 31130. The locomotive retained Coal sector livery until withdrawal in 2000 with its duties including nuclear fuel trains, engineering movements and even passenger workings on the North Wales Coast around 1992.

The specification for the Key Publishing limited edition will see 31276 delivered in Railfreight Coal sector livery with centrally mounted high-intensity lights on each cab front. Etched metal nameplates will be included with the model, but will not be fitted to allow modellers to choose

whether their model represents 31276 before or after April 30 1992. It will have separately fitted metal handrails, flush glazing, in-line brake blocks, etched metal and injection moulded detail parts, chassis fitted optional miniature snowploughs, sprung buffers, correct buffer beam pipework and optional dummy screw link couplings.

Mechanically the Accurascale produced Class 31 will feature a die-cast chassis and injection moulded body, a 21-pin DCC decoder socket, helical cut gears for maximum performance and slow speed running, and gearing for a scale top speed of 90mph. DCC sound fitted models will have a LokSound V5 21-pin chip, factory installed twin speakers, a PowerPack supercapacitor, switchable lighting and a wheel flange squeal sensor for automatic flange squeal. There will also be an independently powered roof fan which will operate on DC and DCC control systems.

Prices for the limited edition of 31276 are set at £169.99 DCC ready and £269.99 DCC sound fitted. Both versions are available to order from the Key Publishing Shop today with a £10 deposit, with delivery expected in summer 2023.

CLASS 66 NEXT FOR

CCURASCALE'S next
'OO' gauge locomotive
project will be the
widespread General
Motors – Electro Motive Division
(EMD) Class 66 diesel.

Built in the late 1990s, an initial order for 250 locomotives was placed with General Motors – Electro Motive Division by the owners of English Welsh and Scottish Railway to modernise its fleet of former British Rail motive power. The first examples arrived in the UK in mid-1998 and subsequent orders for use with other UK freight operators have since tipped the balance to more than 500.

Unveiling its plans at Model Rail Scotland in Glasgow on February 24-26, Accurascale has confirmed that following an agreement with Hattons Model Railways in late 2022 it has purchased the highly-regarded 'OO' gauge Class 66 tooling from the retailer to expand its own portfolio of products.

Accurascale has now integrated the tooling suite into its range and identified a raft of improvements for its new acquisition to further enhance its appearance and running characteristics. Amongst the new improvements are redesigned rotating axleboxes which are set to be more secure and smooth-running, improved access to the Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder through a lift-off magnetic roof section, revised lighting configurations for day, night and yard workings, an enhanced Printed Circuit Board (PCB), plus cube and Accurathrash bass reflex speakers.

In addition, Accurascale has revised the cab step and handrail



arrangement so they are now chassis mounted to improve access to the chassis interior, as well as revising the orientation of the bogie coil springs.

While the tooling suite for the new models was extensive, Accurascale has also taken the opportunity to modify the tooling so further variety is available when selecting models. These upgrades include angled or straight sand pipe fixings on the bogies, correct round profile handrail mounts with five or seven point mounting and a second style of cab interior offering the choice of original pedestal type or more recent wraparound desk.

1980s, acceptance of the class by British Rail was protracted due to a series of technical issues.

Following privatisation, the Class 60s passed to English Welsh &

Scottish Railway ownership where they enjoyed mixed fortunes. Many were laid up during the 2000s with some enjoying a new life following refurbishment. More recently,

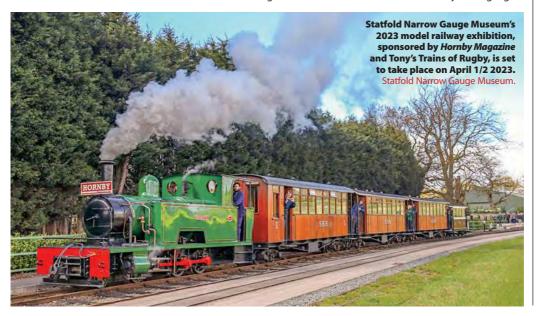

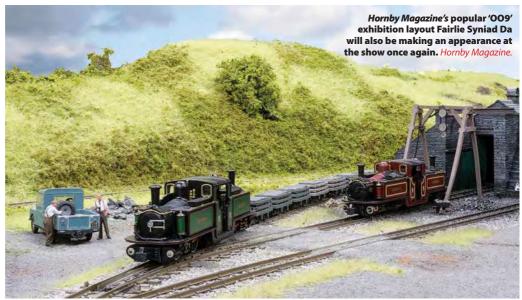

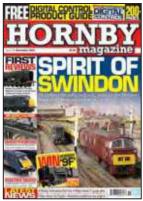

There is always a plan for a new project layout at *Hornby Magazine* - and this issue marks the debut of our latest build to create a multi-era depot in 'OO' gauge. **MIKE WILD** introduces the project in the first of four features which join our new video series on *KeyModelWorld.com* – and an exclusive laser-cut building kit.

Scottish Region Class 37/4s 37424 and 37417 stand outside the newly completed depot in the company of Class 47/4 47595. The laser-cut diesel depot is a stand out feature of the layout and is available as an exclusive kit from Key Publishing.



IESEL DEPOTS are great fun to build and with the right trackplan they are entertaining to operate. For our latest project we are back to working in 'OO' gauge to create a freelance depot scene with a scenic area just under 10ft x 2ft and a total length of 11ft including the storage yard.

The idea was to create something anyone could build at home along one side of a spare room, or in a garage, while offering an ideal space to display a growing collection (hopefully we aren't the only ones!) of locomotives and creating a believable scene.

Like all of our great ideas, the initial concept spiralled. The plan was to use entirely out of the box buildings, but the more we thought about it, the more we wanted to create something unique and with a statement depot structure. PJM Models had the answer as it joined forces with the Hornby Magazine team to develop an exclusive lasercut building based on Stratford Depot in East London which we have now turned into a pair of kits you can buy direct from Key Publishing to build for your own layout (see panel).



Class 47 47595 is prepared for departure from the depot. 3D printed accessories are from Westhill Wagon Works while the figures are 3D laser scanned models of the *Hornby Magazine* team.

DESIGN & PLANNING

The design for this depot layout called for a series of features typical to all locations of this type. We needed a main depot building, inspection pits, a fuelling point, fuel storage tanks and a wash plant. Overlaying all of these considerations was that the trackplan had to be operationally interesting as well as realistic.

The footprint for the scenic area was set at 8ft x 2ft initially with the plan being to add a further 3ft x 2ft baseboard onto one end as a

storage yard. There would be an entry and an exit road, a fan of four sidings going into the depot building plus headshunts to give access to the fuelling point and wash roads. Of interest too is that the overall length is identical to the 'O' gauge depot we built in 2019 called Seven Mill Depot (HM152). You can read more about this build at www.keymodelworld.com/seven-mill-depot.

As with many of our layout designs, once we started laying out the track, changes and adjustments

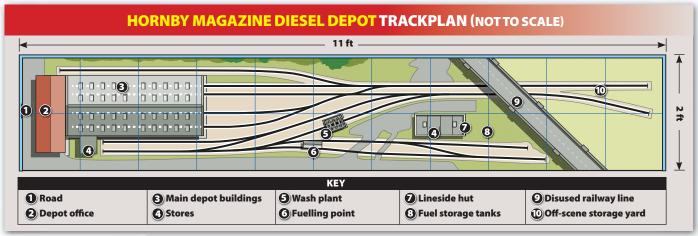
started to flow. An extra loop was added for the wash plant meaning that locomotives can run all the way through on entry or exit to the complex, or bypass it altogether. The fuelling sidings gained additional points so fuel deliveries can be held independently of the refuelling process. Finally, we added a double slip in the entry to the depot which has really enhanced the flexibility – and complexity – of the track plan.

The style of layout meant we could work with solid top baseboards throughout, but again our original plan of a straight scenic break at the join between the 8ft and 3ft long sections changed during the design stage and now sees the scenic break run at an angle across the 3ft long storage yard board which leaves plenty of space for off-scene locomotive storage as well as a more interesting scenic break.

BUILDING THE DEPOT

Construction of the baseboards follows our tried and tested method with a combination of 9mm plywood for the tops supported by a 69mm x 18mm planed timber frame. The timber >>>

This building measures 427mm x 410mm and can accommodate four locomotives inside. It is based on the design at Stratford Depot in East London and includes the office block at the rear (with internal walls and doors) as well as the side extension. It features laser cut walls, ends, roofs and window frames as well as laser cut glazing panels and doors. The kit can be assembled as a standalone building or by using optional parts included with the kit it can be built to be joined with Option A to create a longer building. Price: £135

Available from: shop. keypublishing.com is screwed together following the same methods outlined in our baseboard construction feature in HM175 (www.keymodelworld. com/beginners-guide) which sees a softwood frame cut to length with four cross-members added – one at each end and two set 400mm in from each end of the baseboard.

During assembly of the board which will house the depot, we realised the need to adjust the position of the frame so it didn't conflict with the inspection pits we planned to install, which required one of the cross-members to be moved by 50mm.

Baseboards complete, our next task was painting of the bare timber with 'Hornby Magazine Grey' – that's not a real Dulux colour yet, but maybe we could suggest it – to seal the wood and provide a consistent base colour underneath the future scenic layers. This was followed by installation of the backscene on the storage yard board.

Next, we were straight into the track and rather than use cork underlay, for this project we laid the running lines directly onto the plywood surface. Because of the loose ballasting method we will be using, the sound deadening properties of cork won't be felt while we didn't need to raise the track off the baseboard to create a ballast 'shoulder' because of the depot setting.

All of the track is Peco code 75 using a combination of large and medium radius points plus one double slip. The plain track is all wooden sleeper yard lengths which have been joined to the points with metal or plastic rail joiners as required to suit the electrical plan which allows the layout to be wired permanently live for operation with digital sound locomotives.

The track has been pinned in

place with Peco track pins while the cuts have been made using a cutting disc in a Dremel mini drill for quick and accurate fitting of the track.

One of the larger tasks in the initial phase of the build was cutting the openings for the inspection pits which run the length of the depot. These were marked out using a prebuilt section after which a 13mm hole was drilled at one end to allow a jigsaw to be used to cut out most of the pit opening. However, we realised we had a second crossmember under one end of the pits which meant a change of tool to a plunge saw which, set to a 25mm depth, cut through the plywood top and a limited depth into the timber frame below. Once the top had been removed we were able to knock out the notches cut into the frame to make way for the inspection pits.

GROUND COVER

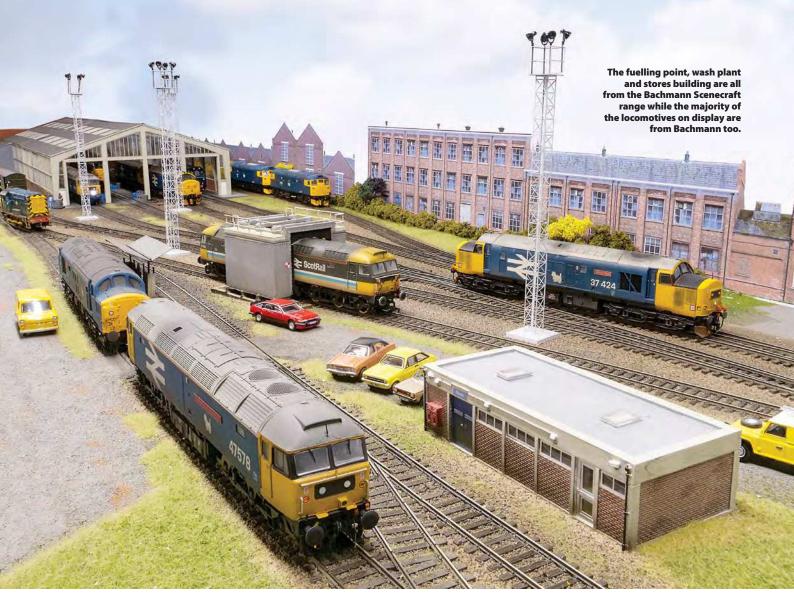
Being a depot the biggest component of the ground cover is ballast. For this layout we have used the Geoscenics 'N' gauge ballasts available from the Key Publishing Shop as the basis for the layout. These are supplied in 500g packs, together with sheets of cardboard for the creation of wagon loads.

The ballast was laid loose across the layout, tamped into place with a 1in wide paintbrush and then glued in place with SBR adhesive. Prior to application of the ballast, a water mister was used to spray a square foot at a time which helps the glue flow more readily into the loose ballast without disturbing it.

Another key feature was the installation of the buildings before ballasting. The fuelling points, fuel storage tank, office and wash plant are all from the Bachmann Scenecraft range and were secured in place with PVA glue prior to the ballasting process. Fixing the buildings down at this stage prevents them from looking like they are placed on top of the ballast as the ground cover flows around the edges to set them in place.

The next big task was installation of the hardstanding around the inspection pits. For this we used sheets of 2mm thick MDF which





was cut to size to meet the needs of the depot floorplan while also allowing an overlap outside the building as a walking and fork lift route. This part of the project took a little time as the 2mm MDF had to be cut to exactly the right shape and size.

Contact adhesive was used to fix the MDF in place after which it was scored with the back of a craft knife to represent joints in the concrete surface. To finish the area, it was sprayed with grey primer followed by Ford Dove Grey to create a concrete finish for the new hardstanding.

Around the outside of the depot, there was a need to introduce further ground cover textures with grasses and bushes around the edges as well as weeds growing between the running lines. All of this was created using Woodland Scenics Fine Blended Turf overlaid with Green Scene static grasses in Spring and Autumn colours mixed between 4mm and 6mm lengths. A Noch Grasmaster was used to apply the static grasses to create a realistic finish.

Further Geoscenics products have been used around the depot including its rather useful Potholed Road kit which contains a fine grey powder as well as a brown powder. These can be applied over neat PVA glue and then the depth can be built up and sealed in place with diluted PVA glue. Adding small patches of brown suggests holes in the road surface and creates a realistic finish to the roads around the depot.

As this issue closed for press, we were applying the first layers of weathering to the ballast and concrete using Geoscenics Track Dirt Kit – also available from the Key Publishing Shop - with a first pass of Track Grime followed by heavier staining using the Black Concentrate suitably diluted. Both of these colours were applied by airbrush which made quick work of the weathering process.

We have plenty of additional details to add to the layout both in terms of weathering and physical details and we will cover these elements in a future instalment as part of this series in both print and video.

MULTI-ERA THEME

While our depot structure takes its inspiration from Stratford Depot, we didn't want to be tied to a single era for the layout – our interests are just too diverse. However, we

needed depot signage to bring the scene to life, but we have been careful about its placement to ensure it doesn't stand out too much. We plan to create removable signage for the depot road entrance in the future so we can switch between different eras.

For the layout's first showing at Model Rail Scotland in February

2023, we opted for a Scottish 1980s theme with BR blue, Large Logo, Railfreight, ScotRail and InterCity Mainline liveried locomotives in attendance while its second appearance at the Statfold Barn Model Railway Exhibition on April 1/2 will see the layout filled with early privatisation era stock for a change of theme.

STEP BY STEP BUILDING A DIESEL DEPOT IN 'OO' GAUGE



Three baseboards form the basis of the layout built from 18mm \times 69mm planed softwood for the frame and topped by 9mm plywood. The softwood frame was marked for cutting first.



To ensure the frame ends don't split during assembly pilot holes were drilled through each end.



 $4.0\,x\,40mm$ wood screws were used to screw all the frame components together for secure and robust joints.



The frame was assembled first using the plywood top as a table for assembly. The two scenic boards are both 4ft \times 2ft while the storage yard board is 3ft \times 2ft.



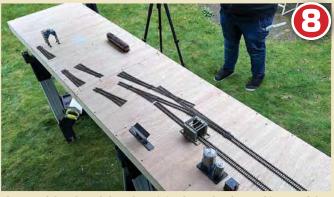
The frame has now been fixed to the plywood top ensuring that all corners are square with a tri-square. Cross-braces have also been added 400mm in from each end of the main 4ft baseboards.



With the plywood attached to the outside of the frame, the finishing touch is to add screws across the cross braces.



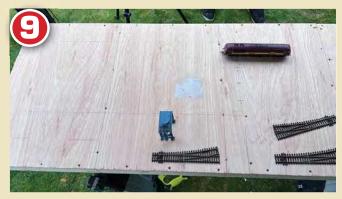
Joining of the baseboards is achieved with a pair of M6 coach bolts and wing nuts. For accurate alignment DCC Concepts alignment dowels have also been installed.



The two 4ft baseboards have been joined together for mocking up of the trackplan. This highlighted where adjustments to point positions were required to work around the cross-braces.

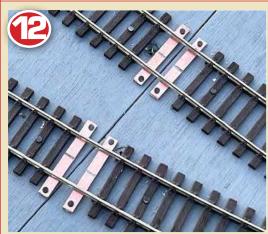
The size of the depot and its track centres were also marked on the board's surface. This showed the need to move one of the cross-braces 50mm to the right in this view to clear the planned inspection pits.



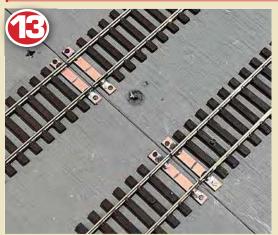
The baseboard surface has now been painted grey and the plain line into the depot has been laid in position using Peco code 75 flexible track.



The entry to the depot complex is handled by Peco large radius points and a double slip. Use of the latter has enhanced the operational flexibility of the trackplan.



baseboard joints copperclad sleepers have been installed to ensure the tracks remain accurately aligned during dismantling and reassembly. These are pinned in place on each side with Peco track pins.



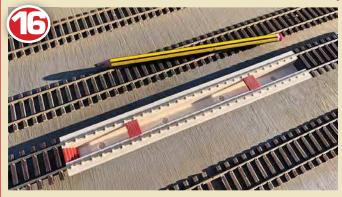
The rails are then soldered to the copperclad sleepers to make a firm joint. Note the cut in the centre of the copperclad sleeper which prevents short circuits.



Installation of the point motors requires a 9mm hole to be drilled under the point tie bar. Its position is marked in pencil beneath each point.



Using a 9mm wood drill in an electric drill, the hole is created and cleaned.



The next step in the project is to make the openings for the inspection pits. A short length was assembled and then used as a guide to mark the baseboard surface for cutting.

STEP BY STEP BUILDING A DIESEL DEPOT IN 'OO' GAUGE



A 13mm hole was then drilled at one end of the pit opening after which a jigsaw was used to cut out most of the pit opening.



To finish the pit openings through the cross-brace, a plunge saw was used to cut 25mm down into the frame and through the plywood surface. Once the plywood had been removed the notched section of the frame was snapped away.



Inspection pits are from the Peco range with eight kits being used for this depot interior. All were assembled with Flex-i-File Plastic Weld glue from Albion Hobbies.



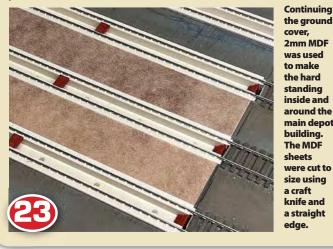
The track layout was then weathered with Humbrol No. 29 from an aerosol, making sure that the point blades were covered with masking tape prior to paint application. The rail heads have now been cleaned again to prepare for testing.



An essential part of any layout project is testing the track formation. With all the wiring complete underneath, all lines were checked for correct operation.



Ballasting followed using Geoscenics 'N' gauge ballast which is available from shop. keypublishing. com. This was applied loose, brushed into place, wetted with a water mister then set in place with SBR adhesive applied with a syringe.



the ground cover, 2mm MDF was used to make the hard standing inside and around the main depot building. The MDF sheets were cut to size using a craft knife and a straight edge.



Cutting the MDF sheets is a simple task, but requires multiple passes with a craft knife - don't be tempted to try cutting through in one go. Always use a steel ruler when cutting with a craft knife.

Multiple sections were built up around the depot to create the concrete apron. At the depot entrance the sleepers were removed from the track so the MDF could be threaded under the rails.





The completed hardstanding was glued in place with Gorilla Contact Adhesive and left to set. With the test build of the diesel depot building in place the scene is coming together.

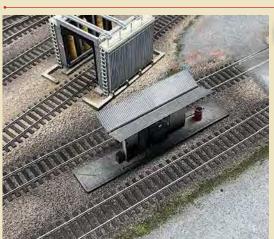

To enhance the appearance of the MDF, the back of a craft knife blade was used to score the timber surface to represent concrete sections prior to the hard standing being painted with Halfords grey primer and then a dusting of Ford Dove Grey from the Halfords range.



Track weathering has now been added using a two-layer approach: one pass of Geoscenics Track Grime followed by a second pass with Geoscenics Black Concentrate watered down. Both colours were applied by airbrush.



Weathering around the fuelling point is much heavier to represent fuel and oil spillages on the ballast.



To add roads around the depot, Geoscenics **Potholed** Road kit was used which adds great texture to the road surfaces and a realistic look to the layout. It is now ready for detailing which you can see in a future instalment in our four-part series.

It's back to maths class as **TIM SHACKLETON** explains how, as far as weathering is concerned, what you take off can be just as important as what you put on.



HIS MONTH I'd like to take a look at two very different approaches to weathering. One involves slapping on layer after layer of filth and leaving it there, while the other entails wiping most of it off again.

Paradoxically, the two methods complement one another very well and can be used again and again on the same model - you can add paint, powder and pigment to your heart's content and then systematically take much of it off again, until you have the effects you seek. After all, real locomotives and rolling stock see a steady buildup of road dirt, exhaust fumes, corrosion, splash marks and much else besides – even sometimes the cleaner's rag. The idea that weathering can be done in one over-simplified airbrushed hit has no basis in reality. A really mature 'WD' or '9F' could take years to reach such a truly wanton state of degeneracy.

Our project models are from one of my favourite locomotive classes of the steam era – the 'J27' 0-6-0s that were the workhorses of the North East for more than 60 years from their introduction in 1906 to their final withdrawal late in 1967. They were absolute masters of their job, which was mostly to do with lugging enormous tonnages of coal around, and I'm told this competency was the factor that allowed BR to divert many of the North East's allocation of new

Class 37s to South Wales instead. Only when the Western Region grudgingly admitted they were surplus to requirements were the missing '37s' sent to County Durham – where many of them had of course been built – and allowed to take up the duties they'd originally been intended for. The victims, of course, were the longlived 'J27s', the last pre-Grouping class still active on BR.

So here we have a selection of 'J27s', some kit-built and some the much under-rated (in my view) Oxford Rail version. All have subtle differences of detail and no two are weathered alike. I'll talk through the various processes involved, from the initial airbrush-driven discoloration to the final touches with pastels and powders. As ever the secret is knowing when to stop - but even then, it's often as easy to take surplus weathering off as it is to put more on. If in doubt, my advice is to down tools and come back the next day. It's amazing how much better things look after a good night's sleep.



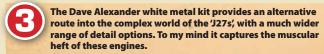
STEP BY STEP WEATHERING 'OO' LNER' J27' 0-6-0S



In real life 'J27s' came with quite a range of detail options but – for now at least – Oxford Rail has released one pre-war and one post-war example. Fortunately, Dave Bradwell offers a huge range of lost-wax detail parts originally produced for his own exquisite 'J27' kit. A few minutes with files and superglue give us the characteristic low dome and a much more believable chimney. Many other variations are possible.



Whilst finely detailed, the spring and axlebox detail of the Oxford Rail model appears on the shallow side, certainly when compared with the equivalent castings from the Dave Alexander kit.





My go-to primer for metal details is the improbably-named Stynylrez. A product of the Badger stable, it's not difficult to find online or from specialist model shops. For best results you should stir or shake it for several minutes and then spray a thin coat through an airbrush. To prevent blockages you'll need one with a nozzle diameter of at least 0.5mm – the lwata Revolution CR is ideal – working at a standing pressure of 55-60 psi.



Still using the Iwata Revolution, but now with the standing pressure turned down to around 25psi, I've quickly sprayed the model with a mixture of colours from the Tamiya acrylic range – Flat Black, Dark Grey and Red Brown. The aim is to provide an ever-shifting background layer of colour on which weathering effects will be built up.



With 65853, the weathering is very much an additive process, steadily building up layers of filth and corrosion one on top of another exactly as happens in real life. With 65844, I went for a subtractive approach, putting enamel paint on and then removing most of it. Both are equally valid ways of weathering models. The core colours are by Revell - Charcoal and Leather Brown. This time the airbrush is the altogether finer Iwata Eclipse CS.



Having sprayed enamel paint around difficult-to-clean areas – underframe, cab roof, tender top and so on – I'm now taking most of it off again with white spirit. This will leave a build-up of dirt in out-of-the way places.



This is the outcome – even at this early stage, the locomotive really does look like it's been cleaned. I like these synthetic flat brushes from ProArte's Series 30 range and they don't seem to mind the harsh solvents we use.

Weathering is applied to 65844's buffer beams and immediately wiped off again, using my limitless supply of worn-out brushes to create irregular patterns that suggest a token effort to clean this



More subtractive weathering – I've added a few dabs of a runny grey wash (Engine Grime from the Mig AMMO range) and now I'm going to blast it with neat white spirit applied at high pressure with an airbrush, coaxing the pigment almost randomly into vertical streaks.



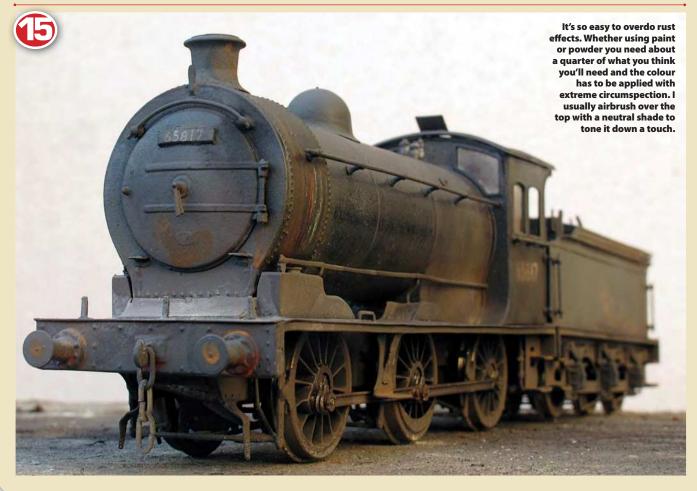

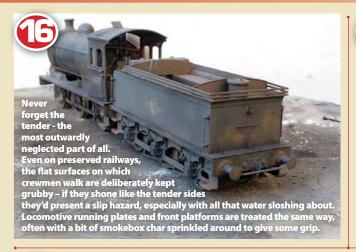


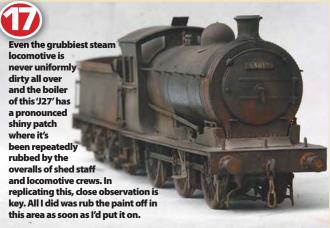

65894 is different again. This was a long-time York engine that was normally kept pretty clean, but when it was transferred to Sunderland in late 1966 its outward condition quickly degenerated and this is how I've depicted it here. Another Dave Bradwell kit, you're left in no doubt that this heavy freight engine had a '5F' power classification.



Working from photographs I could see how worn and patchy 65894's paintwork had become once it reached the Durham coalfields. Neglect, hard work and salt air do this to a locomotive. The effect was achieved by using a sequence of thin enamel washes, each application very slightly different in hue until the desired effect was achieved.



The red coupling rods are a relic of 65894's long sojourn as one of York's pet 'J27s'. I'm not sure it ever did a vast amount of work there and, like the other class members at 50A, you could usually find it simmering gently away in the engineers' sidings at Clifton or on shed at York North.

Every town once had a scrap yard full of hidden treasures. DAN EVASON recreates a typical 1970s scheme in 4mm:1ft scale.

IMES WERE VERY different in the 1970s and if you travelled through any industrial parts of town you would often happen across a scrap metal merchant where you could dispose of your car for cash or perhaps even find a spare part you had spent much time searching for after all, this was pre-internet! These yards would store and

collect scrap metal until the value was at a premium. These would then be collected and taken to foundries for melting and recycling.

With this diorama I have attempted to create my own take on a scrap merchants that could very easily be placed on an urban style 'OO' gauge layout, populated with Oxford Diecast 1:76 scale vehicles and a selection of Scale Model Scenery's 4mm scale

will show you how I developed the scene using a selection of materials, kits, paints and weathering powders. Along the way I'll also explain a few of the techniques employed and share a few top tips too. HM

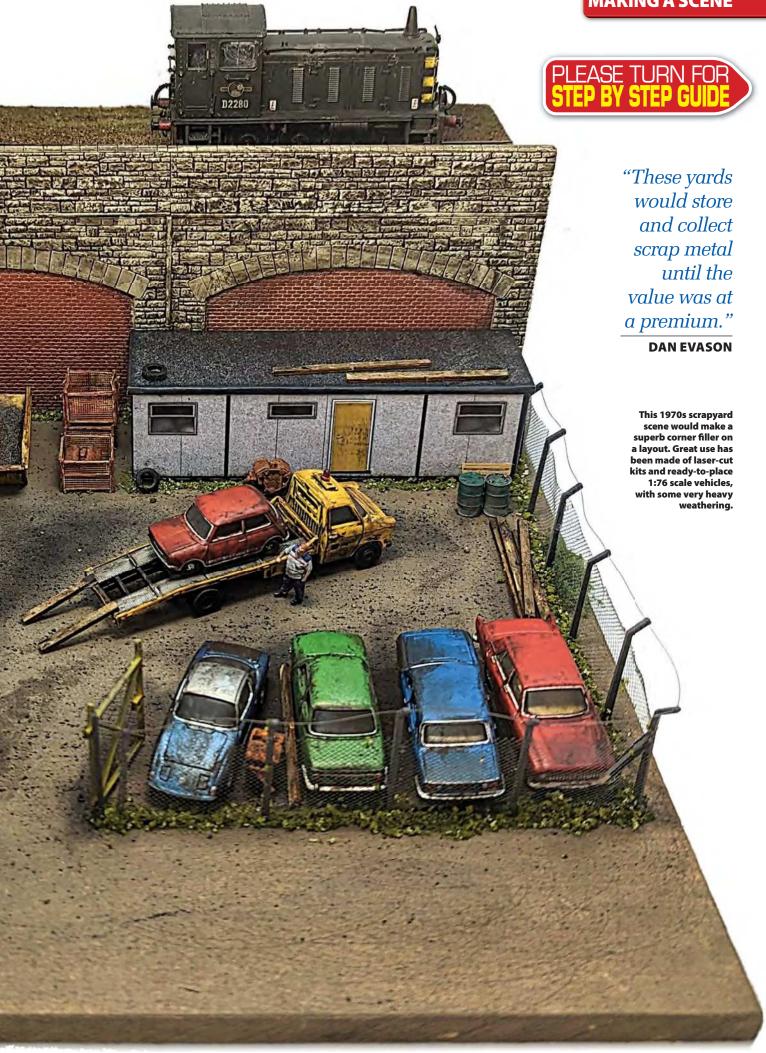
STEP BY STEP MODELLING A SCRAP YARD



For this project, the diorama board size was determined by the Wills stone arches. The arches are a simple design and go together well, although the brick embossed sheet needed trimming to fit within the guides on the reverse side of the stone arch itself. Two sections were used and glued together with Plastic Weld.

STEP BY STEP MODELLING A SCRAP YARD



For the baseboard, 9mm MDF was selected and cut to 350mm x 250mm. I then created a box section at the rear for the arches to be attached. A glue gun was used for speed at this stage. An added bonus of the box section is that it also provided an option to add a railway or road, adding variety to the scene.



Once the arches were glued in place, attention turned to the yard road surface. As the MDF base has no grain pattern, I used 40grit coarse sandpaper to create added texture and set to work scuffing the surface ready for painting.



Once the surface was ready, I painted a milky wash of Daler-Rowney Warm Grey and Burnt Umber over the yard. A little fine soil was also added to give the scene added texture as I wanted to make the yard appear unloved.



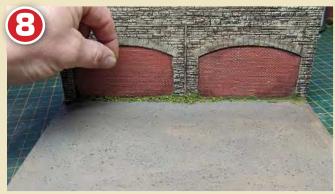
Once the yard was dry, the next task was to transform the clean looking rear arches. To give these a more realistic appearance, I started with the red bricks and applied an all-over mortar mix using Daler-Rowney Buff Titanium with a damp brush.



While the Buff Titanium was still wet, I gently set about removing the excess paint with my thumb until the desired effect was achieved. You may wonder why I used my fingers rather than a tissue: I find the paper can remove too much paint for this technique, so fingers it is!



For the stonework, I like to use Flory Wash Dark Dirt. This is a liquid clay wash which is painted onto the surface and left to dry. You can then use a damp cotton bud and begin removing the excess in a downward movement.



Next, I added greenery to bring the area in front of the arches to life with grass and weeds. For this I used Woodland Scenics Burnt Grass fine turf. This was attached using a small bead of PVA glue and a paintbrush for control.



Whilst searching for appropriate items to place in the yard, I discovered Scale Model Scenery's (SMS) 4mm portable building laser-cut kit. This is supplied with a paper wrap which fitted perfectly and provided a realistic appearance. During assembly of the kit, Deluxe Materials Roket card glue was used for the main framework, while Pritt Stick glue was ideal for attaching the wraps.

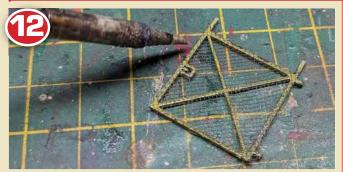




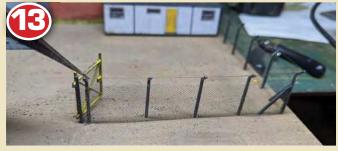
For the 20ft shipping container, I used another SMS kit which comprises a series of laser-cut wooden parts. Whilst it may appear complicated at first, in fact it proved to be really straightforward. You begin by creating a simple rectangular box then clad it with the pre-spaced ribs. Again, Roket card glue was used for assembly and the container was then left to dry.



The SMS range also includes a useful chain link fence kit which contains all you need, right down to the razor wire along the top. As the fence posts are wood and neatly spaced on the fret: I painted them in situ. For the concrete effect Halfords Grey primer was used, followed with a light dusting of Flat Black spray. The metal gates were picked out with Vallejo Deep Yellow.



Applying the chain link to the gates can be a little tricky. I used really thin superglue which worked well and once in place this was then trimmed. Because it was plastic, rather than use a knife I opted for my soldering iron and burnt off the excess, leaving a perfect finish. Do take care at this stage though as you don't want to accidentally remove too much material.



2mm holes were then drilled for the posts 33mm apart. The gateway is a little larger, so you need to allow for that. To attach the chain link, I began by getting a good fastening to the first post with superglue and then letting it flow to the bottom of the post. I then pulled the remainder of the strip around to the last post and glued this too. Once dry, I went back and glued the rest of the posts to the chain link. Tweezers were then used to thread the nylon 'barbed wire' along the top.

STEP BY STEP MODELLING A SCRAP YARD



The metal skips were built next. These are also laser-cut and as they are quite small can be a little tricky to assemble. However, if you apply the glue to one edge and leave it a second to go tacky, you can fix the parts together easily. This was then painted yellow and the decals added.



As I was keen to add as much detail as I could to this build, I also assembled a set of SMS laser-cut stillage bins. These were simple to assemble using small spots of Deluxe Materials Roket card glue to hold them in place.



With the 20ft container kit now dry, a grey undercoat was applied followed by a covering of Dark Dirt Flory Wash. To make it appear more rusty and unloved, MIG Ammo Track Rust weathering powder was applied once the paint was dry. A small amount of powder was sprinked into the cap and mixed with water to create a paste which was then appled to the edges sparingly.



The rust treatment was also applied to the stillage bins before placing them in the yard. At this stage it is worth a few dry runs just to make sure you are happy with the placement before committing to fixing everything in place.



Now the yard is coming together and the detail around the outer edges is growing. Tyres were acquired from an old Oxford Diecast chassis and a few pallets were also added to the scene for effect.



I was keen to model the 1970s for this scene, but as I am a child of the 1980s I was relieved to discover Oxford Diecast's super 1970s car pack introduced for the Oxford Rail 'OO' Carflat wagons, making selection of suitable vehicles easier.



One minor issue with Oxford Diecast's models is that they are in showroom condition straight from the box, so I needed to tone them down for the scrapyard scene. The first stage is an all-over coating of clear matt lacquer, which also helps dull the glazing so you can't see inside the vehicle. Flory Wash was then added before being removed once dry using a damp cotton bud. MIG Ammo Track Rust was then applied to pick out areas of rust and damage.



I initially thought I'd place the cars along the side of the fence leading up to the portable building, but then decided they would be better placed alongside the entrance, with the car transporter next to the office.

Before the cars could be glued into position, weeds and shrubbery were added around the fence line and portable cabin area using Woodland Scenics coarse and fine turf flocks which were left to dry and the excess removed with a brush.



At this stage, the yard was still looking far too clean for the effect I was after, so using DCC Concepts Ultra Black weathering powder, I set to work concentrating on where the cars would be parked and where leaking oil and fuel might appear on the ground.



To fix the vehicles in place, a spot of superglue was applied to the rubber tyres, as these bond really well. The cars were carefully placed so as not to all be facing the same direction – or even squarely – to add visual interest to this area.



At any scrap metal yard, you might see skips full of factory machine swarf. To replicate this, I spotted some fine wire wool on my workshop shelf. For this diorama it was perfect - with a touch of Flory Wash Rust added for the finishing touch.



Scale Model Scenery's 13ft scaffold boards were added to the scene. These plywood parts were treated to a black wash and added to the back of the car transporter to provide a ramp. A Modelu 3D-printed figure was then painted and added to the scene.



Smaller detailing parts were then added, including engines and barrels together with a few more pallets, enhancing the scene further. You could really go to town with a scene like this.



I felt the scrap metal merchants needed a sign, so this was created on the computer. Straight from the printer it was far too bright, so DCC Concepts Rust weathering powder was applied to age it around the edges along with a few passing streaks over the front of the text.



Finally the sign was added to the chain link fence using Pritt Stick glue on the rear of the sign and then carefully guiding it into place to complete the scrap yard scene.

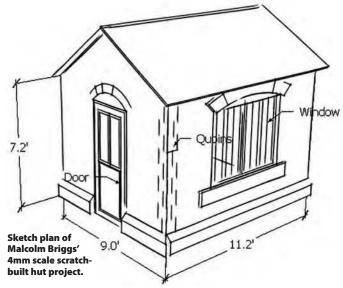

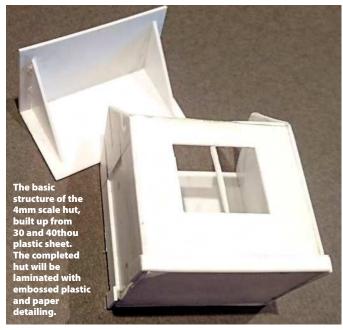


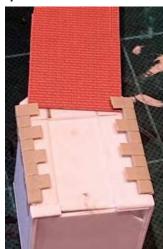

Wills makes suitable 4mm scale mouldings which will provide the basis of the corners to our hut once glued together. Note that the long and short sections have to match.

With the quoins in place, a section of embossed brick sheet is cut to the correct width so it can be slipped into place beneath and between the end sections. You can then mark the apex for the roof and cut to size.





made from 30thou sheet plus an opening cut for a window and a door. Wherever possible, I use ready-made windows and doors – Wills, Merit or York Modelmaking.

SCORE AND SNAP

To cut plastic sheet, simply score it with a sharp knife – I use a scalpel with a No. 11 blade – and once you are more than halfway through, you can snap it cleanly. I reckon to cut 10thou on each pass, so for 30thou it needs two passes; 40thou three passes and so on. To cut openings like windows, score all four sides twice and then flex the material so the cut lines show through on the back. Cut these through again from the back and the whole piece should pop out. It's one of the reasons I use 30thou – anything thicker is very difficult to cut the windows out of. I would rather laminate layers of 30thou if

a thicker wall is needed than use a thicker sheet.

The simple walls are glued together with liquid glue – I tend to use EMA – and a simple inverted roof was made to fit on it. A piece of scrap plastic sheet is put behind the door opening. I often plan my buildings to be an exact number of bricks wide and deep – it saves the issue of closers, except around windows and doors.

Next, thin strips of 40thou plastic sheet were applied around the bottom – about three brick courses deep – to form a damp proof course. These will need to have angled tops to them to encourage water to run off, which I make from filler. It was a typical technique of the Victorian age and had limited success.

The first issue we are going to face is that of matching the bricks around the corner. This needs

careful planning to ensure that a stretcher on one wall is matched with a header, as they represent two sides of the same brick.

Alternatively, you can cheat, like me, and make much use of quoins – raised contrasting bricks or stones that add a feature to a building.

Wills make these with a nice 45° mitre to them, so I simply cut two lengths of the right size and glue them together. Notice how the long and short pieces have to match – much like the stretcher face and header face should for a brick.

When you turn the parts over, you will see that they are built with a solid corner and a thinner face – this is to ensure they can go over the brickwork, so you need to allow for this when making the corner, or laboriously file them off before gluing together. I have done both! The real trick is to get them

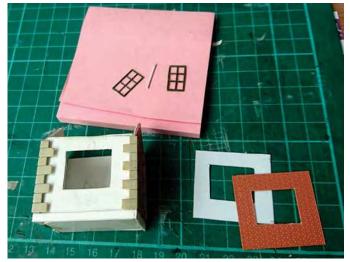
perfectly in line and stuck together so well you can't see the join line – if necessary, let the glue ooze out and sand it back when dry.

MARKING OUT

Once attached to the building, the gap left allows a piece of brick to slip in between them. I now take a piece of brick material the same width as the wall and mark it where the quoins end. This is cut away as far as the point where the apex of the other end of the roof appears over the quoins and is slipped into place. It is then turned over to mark the top of the apex. Once cut out, you can see that it has adopted the same shape as the wall.

We can now add the door and frame plus a snippet of an arch top taken from a Wills set of arches (very useful components for Victorian buildings). Instantly, you can see that this is starting to

In this example, the quoins didn't provide an equal amount of recess to the front of the hut, so it was laminated with an extra layer of plain plastic sheet, overlaid with a layer of the embossed sheet (with window apertures cut-out), pre-painted window frames and a piece of plastic strip to help represent the middle of the frame for the sliding window.



At this stage the frontage looks a little rough at the top edge, where the quoins and bricks don't quite extend to the top, but once the roof is in place it will overlap and hide this. A sill has also been added. The frame was laminated to the glazing material using Johnson's Klear polish.



Before the roof goes on the building, attention turns to the interior. This was created in a computer software package called Sketchup. Once you are happy with the sizing, it can be cut out with scissors and gently creased at the corners before placing within the hut structure. A dry run is recommended before gluing in place.



Once the interior is fitted, the exterior painting can get underway to the bricks and stonework, in appropriate colours. The rain strip at the bottom (three rows of bricks) was then also added along all four sides of the hut.

look like a building. If you were modelling a simpler structure, you might put a plain stone lintel in there.

Alternatively, from about the 1920s onwards, steel and concrete lintels were used and these can't be seen from the outside except for a thin line immediately above the window which, in our scales, looks like part of the window.

The Wills quoins don't always go on the building with an equal amount of recess, so on the front of this hut I had to make another layer to be laminated between the first front and the brickwork. I made this from 15thou plastic sheet.

This has the advantage of making the window reveal look more like scale thickness, although in reality, it needs to be about 3mm thick in 4mm scale, representing about 9in. (Standard UK bricks are just under 8½in long (215mm) by just under 4in wide (102.5mm) and just over 2½in high (65mm). Allowing for a 3/8in (10mm) mortar bed, the rule of thumb is 9in x 4½in x 3in). See Table 1 for more details. From this, you'll notice that most of the printed or embossed sheets are overscale, certainly in 4mm.

Having gathered the components of the front wall – the basic structure, the layers and the windows – it is time to test fit the parts. There are plenty of options available when it comes to suitable windows – I think the ones I used were Merit or Peco.

The windows are meant to be a pair of opening examples, so I had to insert a piece of strip plastic to make up the middle part of the frame – known as a Mullion (horizontal bars are called a Transome). Once painted they were attached to a piece of clear plastic sheet using Johnson's Klear (floor

polish) rather than glue, which has the adhesive qualities of glue but does not fog the plastic. The clear plastic overlaps the window opening and this is what is used to glue the whole window assembly to the back of the wall.

The final task is to assemble it all and then add a window sill from a strip of 40thou plastic, rounded down at the top edges and lightly sanded to take the sharp edges off and give it some texture. You will notice that the quoins do not go to the top of the wall and there is no brick there – it does not matter as the roof overhang will cover that.

INTERIOR

Now to the interior. I like to illuminate my buildings and enjoy adding a simple detailed interior. I use a software package called *SketchUp* to do this, although you could use *Word*, *PowerPoint*, *Paint*

or any similar package, as the techniques are the same.

I start by creating a floor, which *SketchUp* provides with a variety of standard colours and planking effects – all you have to do is shrink it down to an acceptable scale. You could do the same by searching on the internet for 'old flooring' and perhaps take a screenshot of any of the samples offered, as long as they are taken absolutely perpendicular to the floor.

Next you need to create a wall colour – in this case I went for green lower and cream upper. A strip of this is pushed into the building and creased to match the three walls visible through the window. This in turn gives me the relative sizing which is transferred to the image on the computer and then images are inserted at the appropriate place and the whole thing printed again.

While the initial paintwork looks the part, it is quite uniform, so the next stage is to tone it down with a coat of mortar paint, which has then been wiped away with a pad of kitchen towel. This results in the mortar paint remaining in the crevices and also adding subtle tones to the bricks. Here I've also added a ceiling section with a grain of rice bulb routed back to the base of the hut ready to connect up.

Next, the roof section is made up in two parts. Firstly, the top layer is printer paper with lines marked along it for the strips of paper slates to be added. These are cut, layered and glued in place, with each layer overlapping the other by about 50% as you work up to the apex. Then you will need to add a capping strip over the apex.



You might want to add pictures, clocks or even a fireplace. At these scales and through a tiny window, it will not show that it is not 3D. For this task, I added a fireplace and chimney breast (although this was before I realised there was no chimney!), clock, noticeboard and pigeon holes. One of the advantages of *SketchUp* is that you can apply shadows, which you may notice especially on the pigeon holes. I also made a representation of the inside of the door at this stage.

Once complete, the next task is to paint the building. Getting brick colour right is important, as colour varied a lot. For this build I am using a Humbrol colour (Cat No. Matt 70) which is a reasonable representation, but it will be transformed shortly. This is then followed with the stone detailing in the chosen stone colour and then we need to add the brick effect to

the rain strip at the bottom.

These strips are applied with substantial overhang to allow trimming back. At the joins, there will be one thickness of plastic sheet showing unless you mitre both of them. Personally, I just run a triangular file into the grooves of the face to cut a slight indentation in the end of the other face. This seems to work and I use this on all buildings at corners where there are no quoins and around window openings.

For the next stage, a ceiling is cut and a grain of rice bulb inserted to enable the interior to be illuminated before the roof is added.

TONING DOWN

I mentioned earlier about brick colour. Those on our model building are a uniform colour at present. If you look at a typical wall, they are anything but uniform, so



The completed paper sheet is then glued to the plastic roof, which is made up of two sections of plastic sheet and two triangular sections underneath for support. Once dry, the paper roof section is cut to size.



The roof is then painted grey and left to dry. The individual slates don't need to be marked out as at this size it is hardly noticeable, especially once the paint has dried. Tamiya's acrylic Neutral Grev is a good match for slates.



Once dry, a liberal coating of Petite Properties' mortar paint was applied which helps to tone down the overall grey roof colour.

we need to attempt to replicate this appearance in model form. The brick colours can range from orange to blue, due to frost damage, water ingress and the like.

To create realistic brick colours, I usually reckon to cover about 30% of the bricks or stones in about eight colours, but on larger areas it is enough to apply mortar and weathering. I have tried many ways of doing the mortar with varying degrees of success, but a few years ago at an exhibition I hit on a really easy way to apply it, thanks to Petite Properties. It sells mortar paint and I bought two colours -Wishy Washy Stone (WWSP100) and Dirty Stone Mortar (DSMP100). These are emulsion paints and work on both enamels and acrylics.

Once the brick paintwork is dry, simply paint the mortar colour roughly over the surface. Make a pad of kitchen towel that is stretched tight on one side and rub that over the brickwork. This removes the mortar from the bricks and leaves it in the grooves. It takes a bit of practice to work out the correct pressure so you leave the paint in the mortar lines, but is soon perfected. It also changes the colour of the bricks so this must be borne in mind when selecting a brick colour and which mortar colour to choose. This in turn helps age the overall brick colour.

SIMPLE SLATES

Back to the hut, it is time to finish the roof which is simply two flat pieces with two triangles to provide support. For the slates, we need to employ a little magic. In reality these should be incredibly thin and most embossed examples are way too thick. 10thou plastic sheet just about works but has a tendency to warp when sufficient adhesive is applied, so I just use simple printing paper.

However, this can be very difficult to stick to plastic as most of the tile strip is in contact with the strip below, so you would need to apply plastic cement to the top and PVA glue to the bottom. As paper is very easy to stick to plastic and paper sticks to paper with PVA, I now use a piece of ordinary printer paper as the joining mechanism. To make things even easier, I print paper with lines on it appropriately spaced for 4mm tiles and this helps keep the strips level. The paper is placed on the roof and washed over with plastic cement and it sticks instantly!

Just repeat until complete.
Incidentally, I haven't marked
the individual tiles on the paper
– you really can't see these from
any distance and it can serve to
emphasise overscale tiles. You will
also notice that I leave them overlength and trim them back once
the PVA has dried.

Do also bear in mind that the size of slates varies tremendously and some roofs have a number of different sizes on them, usually ranging from large to small as you progress up the roof. For general purposes, 12in long x 6in wide would be the norm. More than half the slate is overlaid by the slate row above and joints are staggered, like brick bonds. For our needs, about 2mm of slate should be showing on each row in 4mm scale.

Next, a thin strip of paper is cut to make the capping stones at the top roughly folded in half and glued on. Bargeboards follow from strips of plastic sheet and the angling of them is largely down to trial and error. I usually work on a 30-35° angle for roofs, so the joint in the middle will be around 15-17½°.

When it comes to painting the roof, getting an accurate slate colour shade is extremely difficult. Many are too grey or too blue so

I use a variety of different shades. For this project I am using Tamiya acrylic Neutral Grey (XF53) but my paint of choice these days is Railmatch Slate Acrylic (2429).

Once the roof is fully painted, I give it a sloppy coat of the Petite Properties mortar mix – yes I know there's no mortar on a roof, but it gives a variation to the colour. Then, I take a step out of the railway modelling field and look to the wargaming fraternity and some of the methods used to add rust and ageing effects to models.

FINISHING TOUCH

As I am planning to use this hut for a weighbridge, it should show the effects of having filthy dieselengined lorries standing by it for years, mostly with their engines running but probably exuding blue smoke from having been recently started. For this, I have selected AK Interactive Engine Grime (AK082).

When you apply it, it looks like a gloss finish, which can be a worry – but don't panic as it will settle and when dry, it darkens the mortar and gives that slightly oily appearance.

For the final flourish, I've also added guttering and downpipes from the Wills range to complete the appearance. Every yard needs at least one of these small huts – mine has half a dozen or so.

There you have it, a completed yard hut. I can usually build one of these in about six hours or so. It is an ideal beginner's project and once you have mastered the techniques to create it, you can progress to larger structures. Next time, we'll be creating a shop, which will involve a more detailed interior.

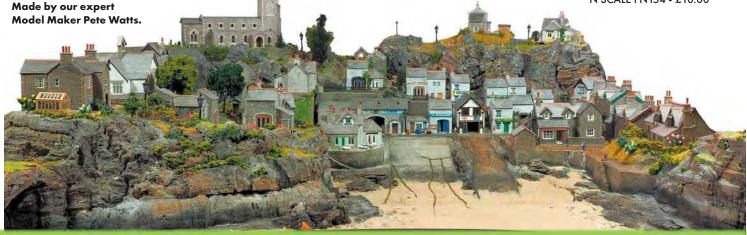

OTON began after I decided I wanted an 'O' gauge diorama to photograph my Heljan diesels in natural sunlight to as realistic effect as possible. I contemplated other depots which had to feature 1960s depot buildings to match my BR green and early blue era $models\ including\ Saltley,\ Cricklewood$ and Derby, but Toton's near legendary status amongst enthusiasts won the day.

Planning and research took around six months with most of that time spent trying to find scale drawings for the depot buildings and certain views of it. Fortunately, I purchased a magazine which featured London Midland Region diesel depots. It had the front and rear elevation drawings of Toton along with some helpful photographs. From this I produced my own 7mm scale drawings for three bays to be modelled and then compiled photographs to work from.

I was lucky in that I knew retired Toton fitter Bill Harrison from my time in locomotive preservation at the Midland Railway - Butterley. Bill was able to advise and assist with information during the making of the main building answering questions and supplying photographs to work from. Without his help I would never have managed to build the compressor house which no longer exists as bays 13 to 15 were extended forward during English Welsh & Scottish Railways' ownership of



the site, changing this part of the depot frontage beyond recognition.

The original diorama took around three weeks to build on a 3ft 4in x 1ft 8in baseboard – but after completing this, I decided to take the plunge and build the previous 12 bays on the frontage. The baseboards are 12mm MDF supported by 68mm x 20mm timber. Two of these new boards are 3ft 4in x 1ft 5in, and the last 3ft 4in x 1ft 8in. There are four bays on the first two boards and three on the last two.

TRACK AND SCENERY

Peco flat bottom flexible track has been used, which matches the real depot well. It was glued to the board with fine cuts made to the rail heads at scale 60ft length and then dummy fishplates were attached to both sides of both rails. 'O' gauge ballast was used on the track with 'OO' gauge ballast running alongside the tracks and baseboard edge. The track was then finished by airbrushing the area between the running rails and along the sleepers >>









firstly with a mix of Matt Black and Dark Grey and then overspraying patches and areas with Satin Black to give the sheen of leaked oil.

The working lights were a challenge as nothing was commercially available close to their design. This meant they had to be scratchbuilt with each lamp taking well over an hour to make with quite a lot of pieces involved. They are amongst my favourite features on the diorama – particularly those above the bays. They give a fan of light across the depot front almost like the real depot lights and really set the scene when photographed in the dark.

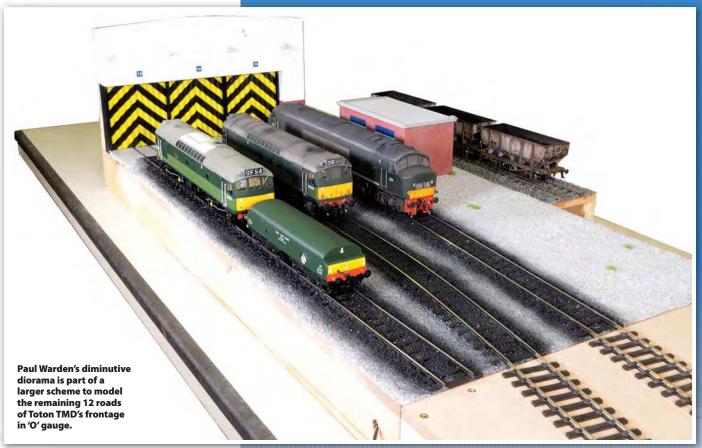
As per Toton TMD when built, there are no signals as the real depot installed the ground signals much later when catch points were installed on bays 13-15 and ground signals and stop boards were installed on bays 1-12.

The board was wired for Digital Command Control, and a test was completed after just two days of assembly and track laying with a Class 25 and Class 45 to check that the dummy fishplates were clear of the wheel flanges.

and era, classes 08, 20, 25, 31, 37, 40, 45 and 47 dominate the BR green and blue fleets, and in the latter, I hope to add a brand-new Class 56 to set the scene. Alongside the locomotives, a 'Lowmac' can be seen with an 8SVT Class 20 power unit loaded, two diesel brake tenders, a London Midland & Scottish Railway steel-bodied tool van and a breakdown train coach in red.

My favourite model is without a doubt the Heljan Class 25/3. This model is superb and with the Legomanbiffo sound chip and two speakers, it sounds as good as it looks. These models have further been improved by replacing the original headcodes with superb alternatives kindly made for me by John Peck of Precision Labels, with the correct font and spacing while maintaining the lighting capacity.

The idea was to have doors which can be opened and closed and allow a locomotive to move off-scene inside the shed. Locomotives also look and sound extremely good started up and moved just in front of the building. On exhibition, it has been used as a demonstration and display for sound-fitted 'O' gauge locomotives.

Of course, doing justice to Toton — whether as-built or today — would take a vast amount of space in any scale and gauge combination, but I hope this compact scene really showcases the level of detail and realism that 'O' gauge can offer — and prove that you don't need a huge amount of space to build something you can be really proud of. **HM**

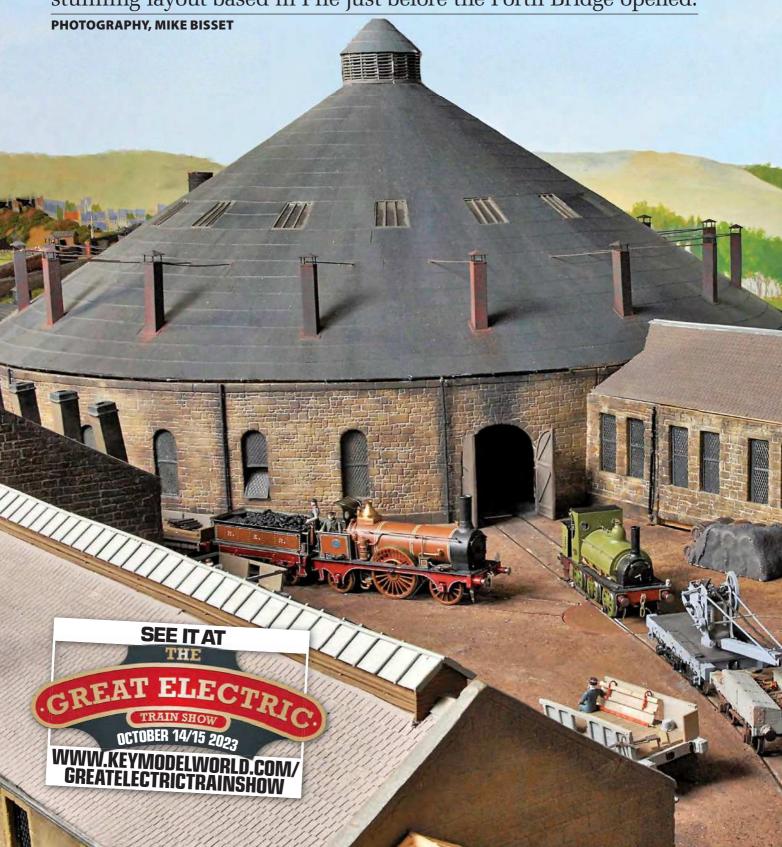






Burntisland 1883

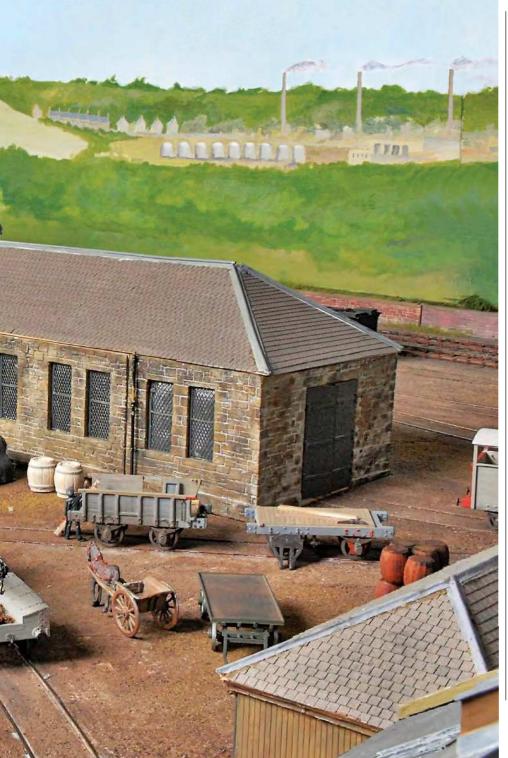
Modelling the Victorian railway is not for the faint-hearted, but **EAST OF SCOTLAND 4MM GROUP** has done just that with this stunning layout based in Fife just before the Forth Bridge opened.



Right: At West Dock, 0-6-0 415 has just arrived with a loaded coal train which 0-4-0 484 is now shunting. To the right, 0-6-0 80A departs with an eastbound empty train.

HE RAILWAYS OF FIFE in 1883 were isolated from the lines to the north and south of the county. A relatively small group of routes ran through Fife, bounded by the Firth of Forth to the south and the Firth of Tay to the north. Ferries were used to connect south to Edinburgh and north to Dundee and beyond.

This isolation led to some interesting railway innovation: freight and passengers were transferred to and from boats, either for the relatively short journey to Granton (for Edinburgh), or further afield. At our date of 1883, there were plans to build bridges over both rivers, but developments had been stalled by the collapse of the Tay Bridge in 1879. The world famous Forth Bridge was begun in 1882, and when opened in 1890, would see the end of the Forth railway ferry from Burntisland.

For the railway's owners, Fife had much traffic potential. As well as the link between the central area of Scotland and the North East, Fife had good agriculture and a lot of accessible coal. It was this latter commodity which would lead to Burntisland developing into a large port.

The builders of this model are the East of Scotland 4mm Group. Most of our active members are from the Edinburgh, Lothians and Fife area, though we have many members further afield contributing in various ways, whether research or assembling something and delivering it to the layout. The model is large, with a scenic section around 34ft long, plus storage vards.

The model was started more than 20 years ago when the Scalefour Society ran a competition for models built within a size limit of 18.83 square feet. So, with that number in mind, an entry was built: 18.83mm gauge, 18.83 square feet and set in 1883 and won the competition - the area modelled were the station buildings and the approach along the dock wall to the passenger station. From that relatively small start, something larger was born.

Members of the group have diverse interests, and some spend a lot of time >>>



for the real railway as it is for us. The roundhouse has a turntable in the centre, and 16 roads radiating from it.

One problem with roundhouses is they are difficult to extend, something the prototype discovered soon after our period as larger new locomotives would not fit on the turntable or in the storage roads.

The interior of the roundhouse is modelled, and viewed via cameras inside. There is a screen for exhibition visitors, duplicated for the operators. Access into the roundhouse is under the water tower, and immediately outside the water tower is an ash crane, which is motorised and empties the ash from the pit into a waiting wagon on a short spur. The roundhouse has been a testbed for a number of successful electronics projects to control the rotation of the turntable, the operation of the ash crane, and interlocking the track.

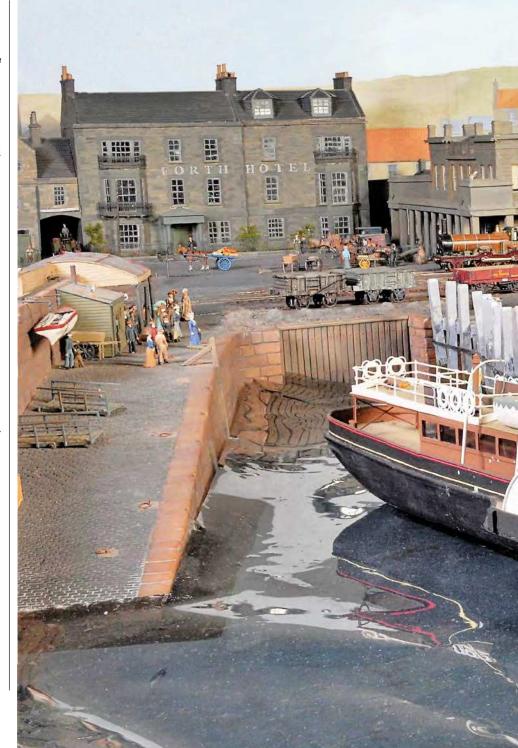
researching archives, this being essential to find the details to construct models where little survives in museums or preservation. Once substantial buildings and engineering have been demolished, we have to work from a few old photographs and what can be found on various maps. We have developed a close connection with the Burntisland Heritage Trust, which has provided much useful information, and we regularly take the model to Burntisland itself to show to local schools and the general public.

The group is interested in developing and learning new skills and techniques: In tackling a model from this period, we were aware there were no ready-torun locomotives or stock available. There was historical research to undertake, locomotives to build, and working out how to produce large quantities of rolling stock. There were large and distinctive buildings to make, and a lot of water in the harbour to complete, with ships - which is a whole area of model making on its own. We have continued to learn and try out new ideas. Details are added to the layout on a regular basis and new approaches are tried particularly in the area of technology. Back when the model was first planned it was to use Digital Command Control (DCC) - cutting edge for the early 2000s, particularly with the very small size of our locomotives.

As a group we do not have regular premises. Typically, the layout is assembled somewhere for a few weeks and work undertaken, and sometimes sections are taken away to be worked on individually – to this end the electric systems have been modified to allow sections to be powered individually, ensuring we can keep the layout portable.

A TOUR OF BURNTISLAND

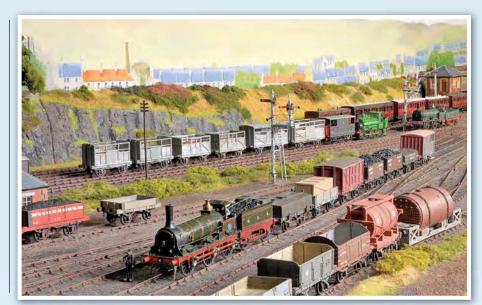
At the eastern end of the layout is the large roundhouse and beyond it a collection of workshops for constructing and maintaining wagons, locomotives and other railway vehicles. Access to these workshops is through the roundhouse, which was as much an operating problem



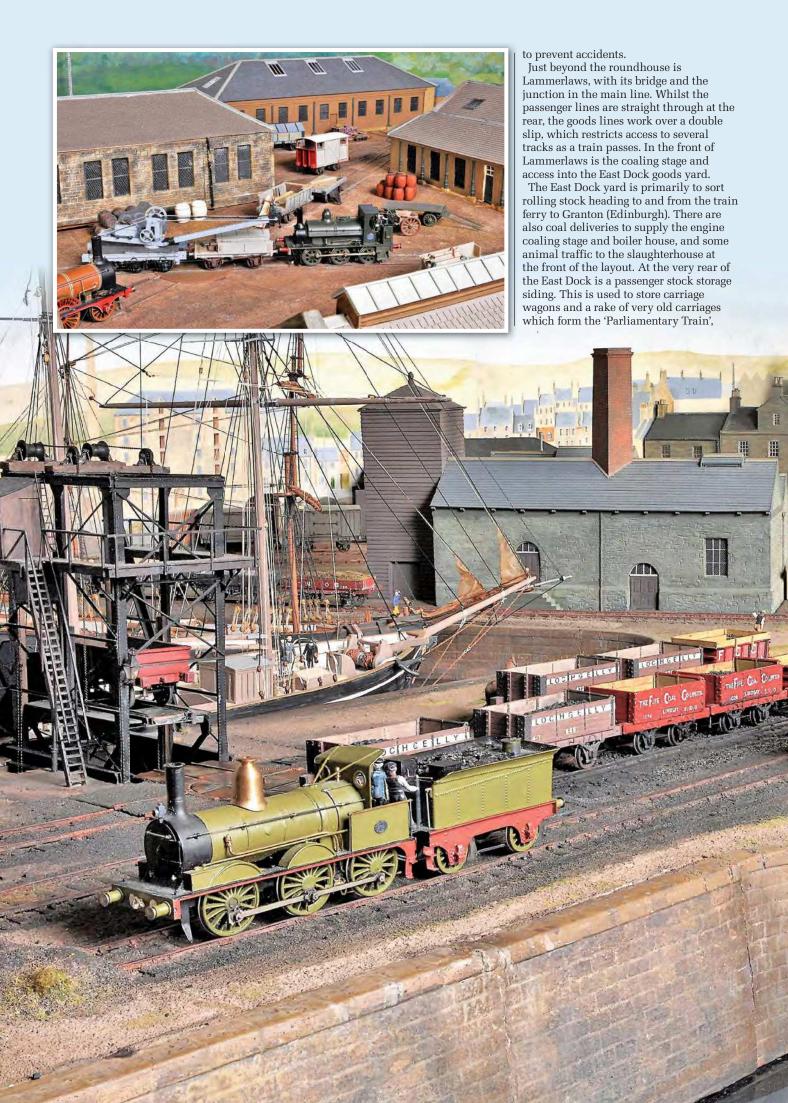

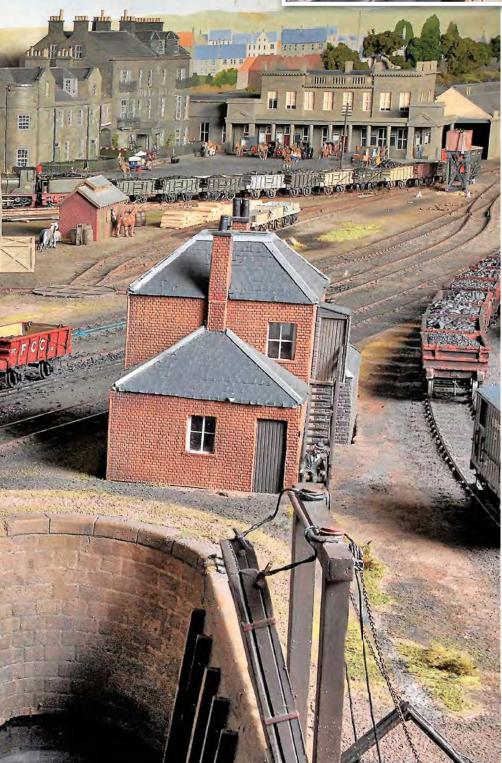


Left: 0-6-0ST 144 returns the crane to the yard, while materials continue to be unloaded. Note the wagon turntable beneath the crane.

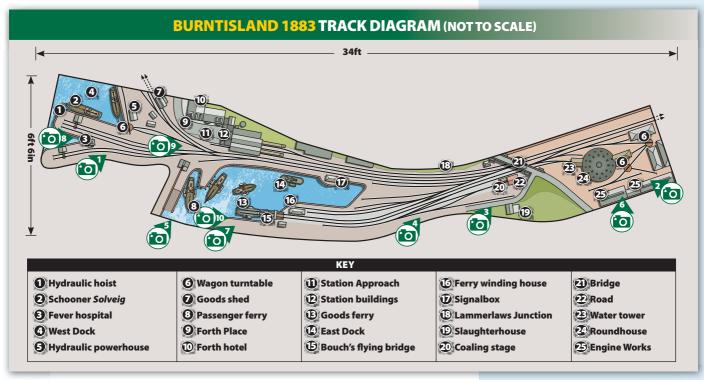


which was required to be run at a very low fixed fare.

At the western end of the East Dock is the loading ramp and the train ferry Carrier. In 1850 there were plans to install cranes to lift wagons from the quayside onto a ferry with corresponding cranes to unload in Granton. Before the cranes were installed, the line's engineer Thomas Bouch and his assistant Grainger came up with the idea of the connecting bridge or linkspan which would adjust for tide and water movements, and a ferry with track laid on it – the world's first roll-on roll-off ferry, a design which is used on ferries to this day. The ferry has tracks arranged so that it can carry either two rakes equally balanced or one rake in the centre. This requires some complex pointwork at the top of the system to allow access to any of the three rails. Our model has a working mechanism for the bridge, so it can be raised and pulled up the slipway, as well as winches which place wagons on the ferry.

Behind the water of the East Dock is the embankment carrying the main lines and the passenger terminus. Passenger trains arrive in the train shed, and the coaches are pulled back by the station pilot before the locomotive is sent to the roundhouse for turning. The regular service is a fast train to Tayport (for the ferry to Dundee) and a slower stopping train. The fast service is usually pulled by locomotive 224, which was nicknamed 'The Diver' as it was the one which fell into the Tay when the bridge collapsed in 1879, and was recovered and re-built.

Passengers would leave the station to the large paved area outside the imposing Forth Hotel. To reach their onward ferry to Granton, they had to walk over the freight lines carrying coal trains into the West Dock area — with very little consideration of their safety when crossing the lines!



still exists minus the train shed. The passenger ferry and the train ferry ceased when the Forth Bridge opened in 1890.

The western end of the model shows a small part of the extensive West Dock. Here trains of coal arrive from the Fife mines for export. Quite a lot of coal was exported to Scandinavia, and in return those ships would bring in timber for pitprops. Our model includes the Solveig which is taking on coal. To load coal into ships, the docks were equipped with four hydraulic wagon hoists to rapidly empty a wagon into a ship's hold. We have modelled a working example but the remainder are off-scene to the rear of our model. A coal wagon is brought up to the hoist using rope capstans, and then turned on a turntable, before being horse drawn into the hoist. The wagon rises in the hoist, and is emptied through its end-door into the ship.

The West Dock model only shows a small fraction of the real dock area, so a number of our trains work through to the west storage yard, and return with workings of empty wagons.

ALTERATIONS

The main elements of the model were largely complete in 2017, though with some detailing work to complete. An appraisal of how the layout came across at an exhibition was undertaken and we concluded there were two main issues reliability and visual appearance. To tackle reliability, we looked at all faults carefully to identify the underlying causes. This might be a change inside a locomotive, relaying track, rearranging electrics, or adjusting rolling stock. We added stay alive devices in smaller locomotives and changed to stepper motors inside some of our mechanical devices. We updated the control panels to make them clearer.

Control is through a Lenz LZV100 5amp Digital Command Control (DCC) system with Lenz LH100 and LH101 handsets. Power district management is dealt with through half a dozen Model Electronics Railway Group (MERG) digital cut-out kits. Signals are servo driven and, again, make use of MERG products – in this case Servo4 units – while the turnouts are mostly fitted with Tortoise slow action point motors. LED lighting and the motor operated features employ a lot of microcontrollers.

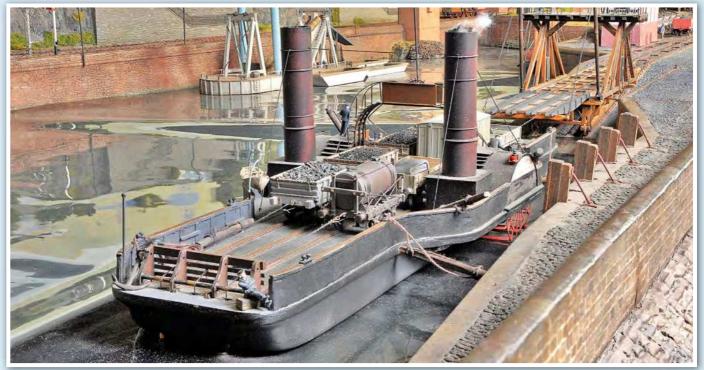
Before 2017, we had a low backscene which meant anything behind the layout was visible and could distract a viewer, so an integrated system of backscene, curtains, adjustable LED lighting and pelmet was produced to improve the appearance for the viewer. This combination ensures there are fewer visual distractions and creates a stage for visitors to view the model.

We are conscious of putting on a show for the exhibition visitor. We want to keep trains moving – yes, they are prototypically accurate and carefully researched - but they also keep moving. The real Burntisland West Dock alone could export 4,000 tons of coal a day, with passenger and East Dock trains additional to that. We have incorporated numerous moving features to the layout, as explained earlier and some of these can be operated by visitors to the show.

At most shows one of our team will be in front of the layout wearing a top hat so they can be easily found to answer questions and indicate interesting features to visitors. In the future we intend to show Burntisland 1883 twice a year in as many different places around the country as possible – and this year, one of those is the 2023 Great Electric Train Show in Milton Keynes on October 14/15 – we hope to see you there. **HM**

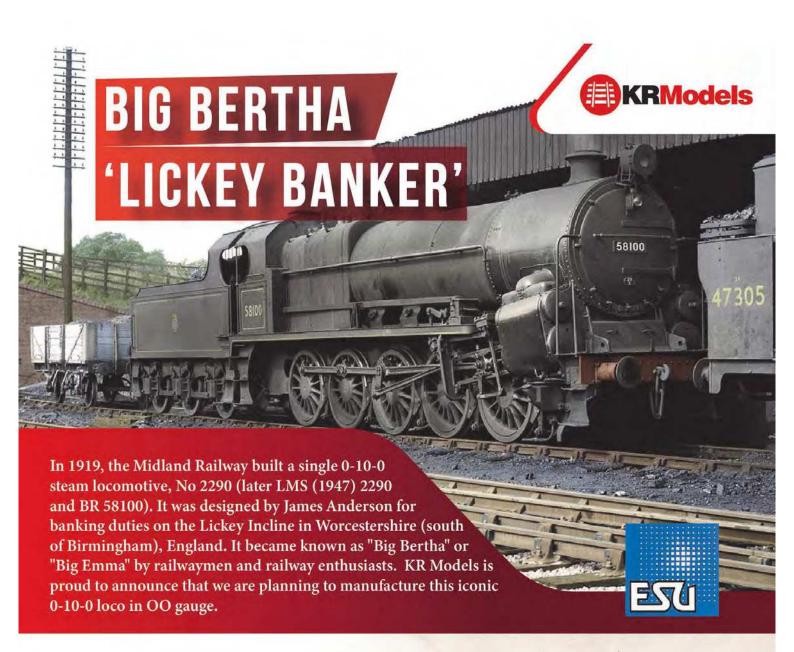

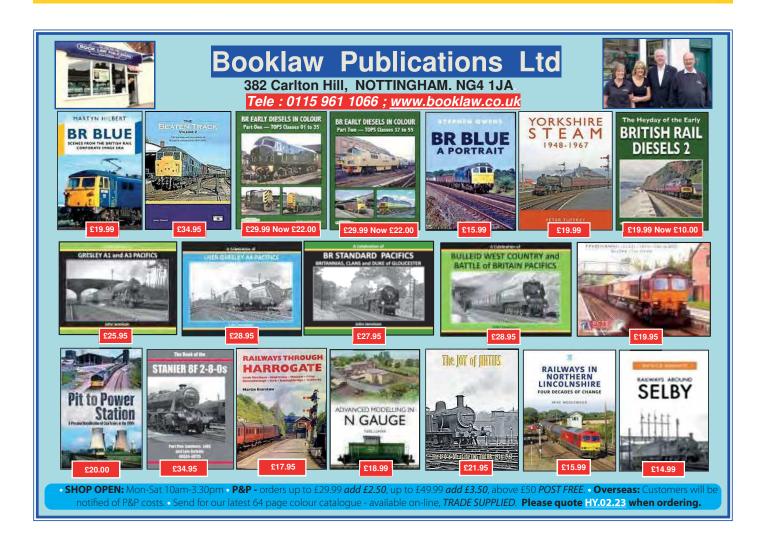

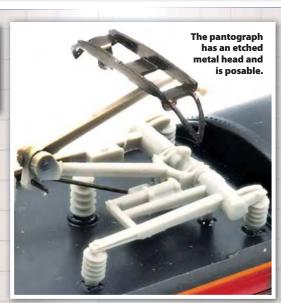


The all-new CLASS

FIRST REVIEW

Graham Farish has released its hotly anticipated all-new Class 90 AC electric for 'N' gauge.

MIKE WILD takes a closer look at this enticing new addition.



Finished as 90004 City of Glasgow, our sample of the new Graham Farish Class 90 was superbly finished.



HE INTEREST in overhead electrics continues to grow, and not just in 'OO' gauge. In its Autumn 2022 British Railway Announcements, Bachmann Europe revealed that the Graham Farish 'N' gauge range would be bolstered with an all-new model of the 1987-introduced Class 90 Bo-Bo electrics.

I remember the excitement of the original Graham Farish Class 90 which was released in the late 1990s. At the time the only other choice for an overhead electric in 'N' gauge was a Class 91 from the same source – unless you had one of the out of scale Lima Class 86s. That first model even had a metal pantograph, but it was a product of its era with the fairings mounted on the bogies, no lighting and a standard non-DCC chassis.

Times have changed over the years and it is great to see the Graham Farish brand step up and offer a modern take on this important piece of West Coast Main Line traction.

The first of the fleet of 50 locomotives was completed at British Rail Engineering Limited's Crewe Works in 1987 with the last emerging in 1990. They were designed to operate from 25kV AC overhead supplies on the West Coast Main Line and beyond with a maximum speed for passenger operation of 110mph.

In essence they were a development of the Class 87, but this time the cab design was revised inside and out while the electrical equipment was also upgraded to the latest design. They delivered 5,000hp which made them capable of handling WCML expresses while they also had, and continue to have, a long

association with intermodal freight traffic.

Current operators are DB Cargo, Freightliner and Locomotive Services. While they are no longer used for daily passenger work, they were once a mainstay of WCML workings as well as being used on the Great Eastern Main Line following their withdrawal by Virgin Trains in the early 2000s. THE MODEL

The Bachmann Europe Development Team is no stranger to the BREL Class 90 having produced a highly-regarded 'OO' gauge model in 2019 for the Bachmann Branchline range (HM145).

Five versions have arrived in the first batch modelling 90004 *City of Glasgow* in Virgin Trains colours (Cat No. 371-783), 90005 *Financial Times* in BR InterCity 'Swallow' livery (371-780), 90019 *Penny Black* in Rail Express Systems red and grey (371-782), 90037 in Railfreight

Distribution branded triple grey (371-781) and 90047 in Freightliner G&W orange (371-785). Prices are set at £194.95 for the DCC ready versions and £294.95 for the DCC sound-fitted options. In addition a new version was announced in the Spring 2023 British Railway Announcements finished as 90042 in Freightliner Powerhaul colours (371-790).

Our sample is 90004 in Virgin Trains colours – a superbly applied livery by Graham Farish which suits these locomotives well. Intricacies of the livery include Virgin logos, tiny lettering at the bottom of the body, coloured clips on the battery boxes and even orange on the cable connections on the buffer beams.

The shape and proportions of the body match the design of the real locomotives while the roof is brimming with detail including a posable pantograph with an etched metal head. We didn't find this the easiest to unhook from its closed position, but it is undeniably fine.

The finesse continues through the body, which has the correct differences in the grille layout on each side as well as neatly moulded handrails at the cab doors and flush glazing.

PERFORMANCE

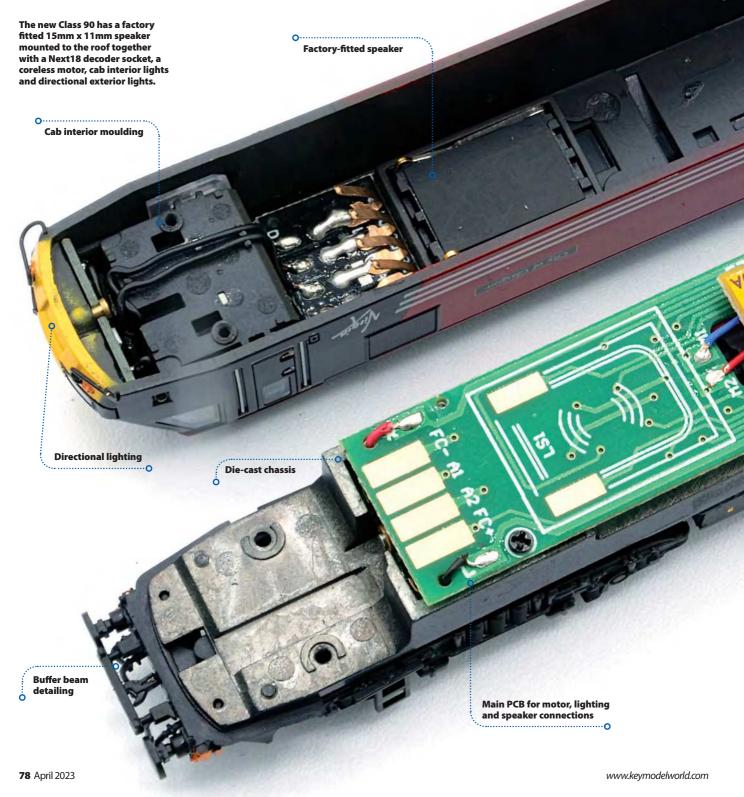
Inside, the Class 90 is fitted with a coreless motor, twin flywheels, a Next18 decoder socket and a 15mm x 11mm cube speaker.
There are also switchable lights – including cab interior lights – which can be managed through switches on the chassis for analogue operators and through a decoder on digital layouts.

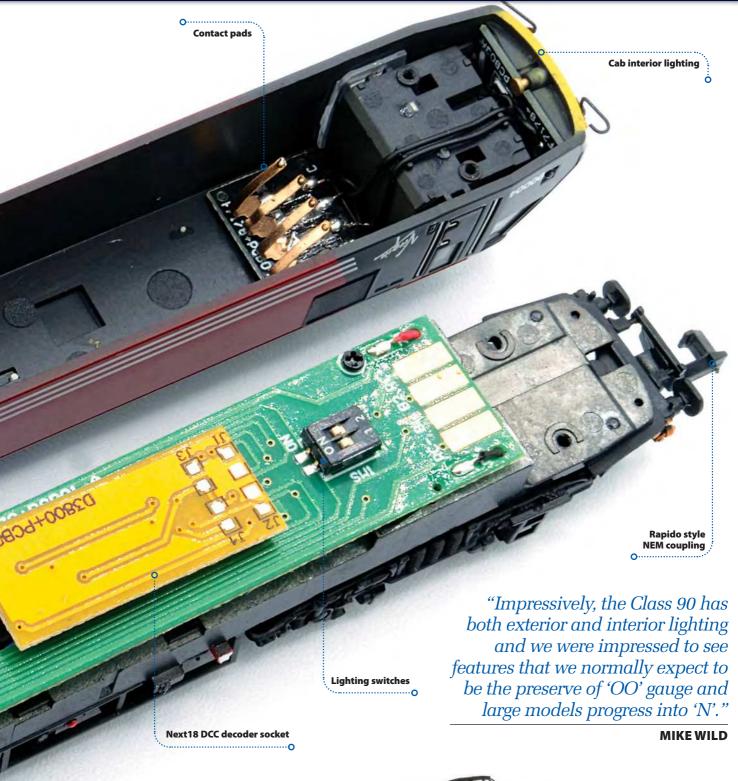
Access to the chassis is a little unusual. First, the bogies have to be removed (they are clip fitted into the chassis), after which four screws can be accessed to allow the chassis to drop out of the body. It sounds more complex than it is and

in reality makes access to the inside quite simple.

The factory-fitted speaker is fitted to the roof of the body and makes contact with the chassis through contact pads on the main circuit board. Our DCC ready version had a Next18 socket blank installed, but there is ample space to install a standard motor or full DCC sound chip inside.

Impressively, the Class 90 has both exterior and interior lighting and





we were impressed to see features that we normally expect to be the preserve of 'OO' gauge and large models progress into 'N'.

On the track, our sample of 90004 ran smoothly and quietly – near silently – but like most new models required a running in period of 30 minutes in each direction at medium speeds before being subjected to load testing. Our tests were conducted with a rake of 10 Mk 1 coaches which the Class 90 handled with ease making it perfectly suited to scale length Mk 3 push-pull sets or intermodal trains.

OVERALL

The all-new Graham Farish Class 90 is an excellent addition to the range and provides the opportunity to model realistic West Coast Main Line settings in 'N' gauge alongside the Revolution Trains Class 92 and even its Class 390 Pendolino if you wished to model the transition to multiple unit operation.

Performance, appearance, detail and finishing are all excellent on the new Graham Farish Class 90 and a world away from the previous generation model in every respect. A great addition produced to the highest standard. (MW)



Accurascale's CALEDONIAN SLEEPER MK 5s

The striking Caledonian Sleeper Mk 5 carriages whisk passengers from London to destinations in Scotland overnight and now you can add them to your collection in 'OO' gauge.

MIKE WILD gets the full story on Accurascale's first ready-to-run passenger carriages.

EW locomotive-hauled carriage sets don't enter service very often on the modern multiple unit focused railway, but in 2019, the first of a new series of Mk 5 sleeping carriages entered service with Caledonian Sleeper for Anglo-Scottish overnight trains.

These new carriages were the first to enter revenue service since the BR Mk 4s in 1989 (the Channel Tunnel 'Nightstar' sleeper coaches never carried passengers and were

exported to Canada) and were brought in as replacements for the ageing Caledonian Sleeper Mk 2/3 fleet. Construction started in 2016 with the full fleet of 75 coaches being completed in 2018 by CAF in Spain while testing took place at Velim test track in the Czech Republic prior to delivery to the UK via the Channel Tunnel.

The new Mk 5s operate in rakes of 16 coaches with formations named 'The Lowlander' (for Glasgow and Edinburgh) and 'The Highlander' (portions for Fort William, Inverness and Aberdeen). There are four complete sets operating on a daily basis with additional spare coaches to cover for maintenance while the Fort William portion gains additional lounge and seated coaches at Edinburgh.

These heavy trains – the longest passenger trains to run on the British railway network – are hauled by Class 92s from London to Glasgow/Edinburgh with the Highland portions taken forward by re-engineered Class 73/9s, all supplied by GBRf under contract to Caledonian Sleeper operator Serco.

While the West Coast Main Line is the primary route for the Caledonian Sleeper trains, on occasion they are diverted via the East Coast Main Line when there are engineering works on the normal route expanding the modelling opportunities for these trains. Another alternative would be to model a part set arriving via the Channel Tunnel on the





Magnetic Dellner couplings are fitted as standard to each coach, but our tests showed that the maximum train weight which could be managed by these was eight vehicles. Optional tension locks are included with each set for the outer ends.

THE MODELS

Four vehicle types make up the Caledonian Sleeper Mk 5 fleet: Club Cars (CC) with space for up to 30 dining passengers, Seated Cars (SC) with seating for up to 30 passengers, Sleeper Cars (SLC) with six single-bed ensuite rooms and four single bed non-ensuite rooms and Accessible Car PRM (ACC) which have one accessible double

room, two double ensuite rooms, two single bed non-ensuite rooms and one accessible single room.

Accurascale's Mk 5s are being offered in packs to allow modellers to replicate the 'Lowlander' and 'Highlander' trains in full or part. The 'Lowlander' consists of four four-car coach packs which create the two eight-coach portions for Glasgow and Edinburgh while the 'Highlander' consists of three four-car coach packs and a fourth six-car coach pack for the Fort William

portion. In the case of the latter, a full London-Edinburgh working of the 'Highlander' would drop the lounge and seated cars to reduce the formation from 18 to 16 vehicles.

Our review samples all model vehicles from the 'Lowlander' set covering packs 1-3. Each pack is smartly packaged with the four coaches contained with a plastic tray. There is also a 'wand' included with each set to control the lighting on the coaches (see Performance)

while optional destination panels are included separately allowing customers to add their own choice for northbound or southbound workings. However, these will need to be fitted with care to prevent any glue marks appearing on the carriages and take note that each pack of destinations is coach specific as well.

Externally the coaches are superbly presented with neatly applied decoration covering both painted and printed detail, though >>>

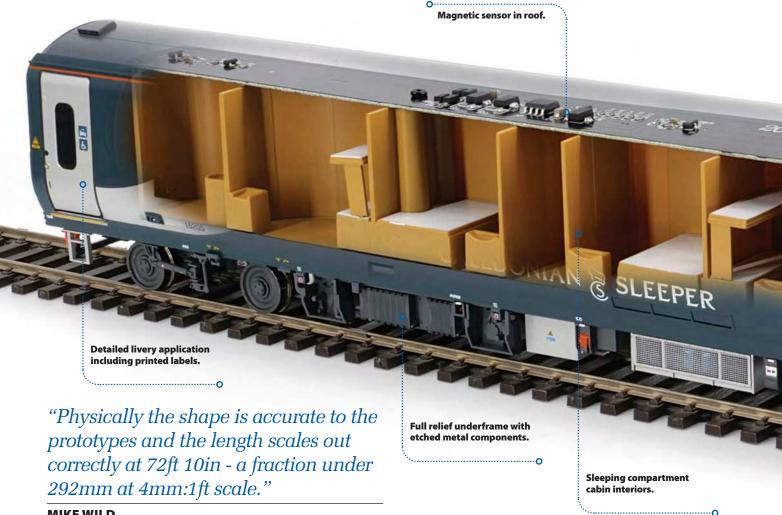

we did notice that a couple of window frame prints were out of registration on our samples. Close inspection reveals the level of attention placed on these coaches with the bogie sideframes even having individually applied printed details.

Physically the shape is accurate to the prototypes and the length scales out correctly at 72ft 10in - a fraction under 292mm at 4mm:1ft scale. Added to this are correct window layouts for different

vehicle types, flush glazed tinted windows and, where appropriate roof mounted equipment. The underframes are in full relief and even have separately fitted etched metal parts while modelling of the cooler groups is nothing short of exceptional.

The bogies are an inside frame design which puts the full wheelface on show while each end of the coaches is appointed with working tail lights as well as a full set of impressively robust body

mounted cables. The gangways too are suitably detailed and thanks to the factory fitted magnetic couplings there is barely 2mm between the gangways on straight track.

PERFORMANCE

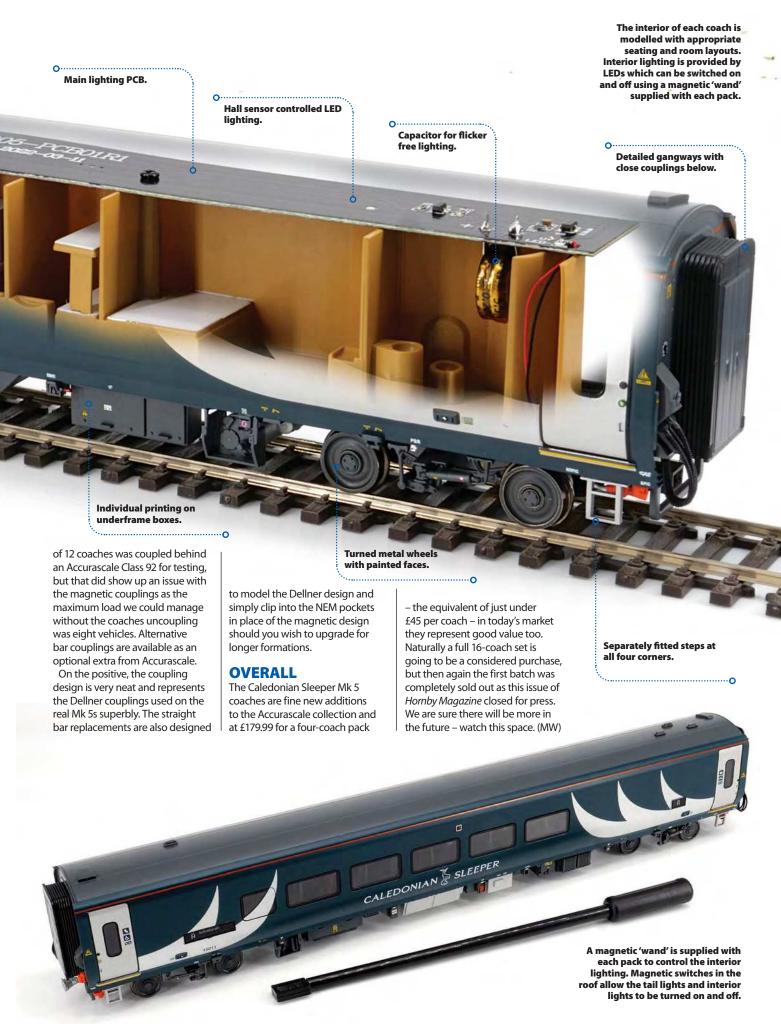
These new carriages have novel functionality, as the lighting - which operates on analogue or digital layouts straight from the box can be turned on and off using a magnetic 'wand'. There are three

switch points in the roof - central controls the interior lights while a 'wave' over each end will turn the tail lights on or off as required. The lighting for the tail lights is excellent, but we did notice light bleed from the carriage windows which is unfortunate.

Running qualities were excellent and despite each coach having all-wheel pick-up to power the lights, we were impressed by the free-running nature of these inside bearing coaches. Our sample train

KOUAKKAGES

Although locomotive-hauled coaches are largely a thing of the past, there has been one fleet of new-builds in recent years - the Mk 5s operated by Caledonian Sleeper and TransPennine Express. **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** looks into the background of these interesting vehicles.

HE ORIGINS of the Mk 5 coach project can be traced back to 1997 when, during privatisation, sleeper services between England and Scotland became part of the ScotRail franchise, which was first allocated to National Express to operate, and later to FirstGroup.

Both of these operators continued to use the former British Railways stock, which was at the time relatively modern. However, in 2012, the Scottish Parliament decided that the sleeper operation should be split from the rest of ScotRail, with potential bidders being informed that the expectation was that rolling stock would be updated or replaced.

The franchise for the sleepers was won by Serco under the Caledonian Sleeper brand, which promised to invest around £100m in new rolling stock with the intention that this would be a significant upgrade to that which then existed. The new coaches would contain features such as en-suite bathrooms, showers, double rooms and purpose-built lounge and catering cars. These would be the first new locomotivehauled vehicles to be introduced to our railways for almost 30 years.

The order for 75 vehicles was awarded to Spanish firm Construcciones y Auxiliar de Ferrocarriles (CAF) in 2015 at a cost of £145m and was to consist of six different types of coach, although this was later

berths were substituted for aircraft-style individual sleeping pods on some vehicles.

The designers of these new coaches faced some challenging problems, in particular that a 16-coach rake had to be able to fit into London Euston's longest platform, which had previously been possible due to the inclusion of some shorter Mk 2 coaches within the sleeper rakes. However, with the new coaches all being the same length there was a danger that the completed rake would be too long. As a result, it was decided that the coaches would be built to a length of 72ft 10in, slightly shorter than the 75ft 6in used for the Mk 3s and Mk 4s, and this short length has been used for all builds of the Mk 5 ever since, even those that never go near London.

When the order was placed the new coaches were described as being like a 'hotel on wheels' and were fitted with a considerable number of innovations intended to make travel on them as comfortable as possible. Included in these were the use of the Dellner Type 12 coupler which provides semi-automatic mechanical and pneumatic functions, with special dampers to avoid waking travellers during night-time shunting manoeuvres. These couplers are also capable of being operated without staff having to go between the carriages. What were to become the Mk 5s also utilise extruded aluminium sections for the body and share many features with that company's extensive range of multiple units, including bogie and brake components.

Of the four types of coach intended for the Anglo-Scottish operation, only two actually provide sleeping accommodation. The first has six bunk bed cabins with shower and toilet and four more cabins without en-suite. The second has two double rooms with shower and toilet, two conventional single berths along with one double and one single room, both fully accessible to persons with reduced mobility. These coaches also have two accessible toilets at the vehicle ends. A coach is provided in each rake for seated passengers and this has larger seats than normal so it only accommodates 30 passengers as well as the guard. The final vehicle is a club car that has dining space for 30 in booths or on stools as well as the galley where food can be prepared.

Because of the harsh environment in which the Mk 5s have to operate in Scotland, each is capable of working in temperatures as low as -25C. Underfloor waste tanks are fitted with frost precautions while an automatic heating system prevents freezing of other components while the train is stabled. Each coach is also fitted with a Train Control and Monitoring system which records the state of critical components and communicates this information to on-train staff as well as to ground-based maintenance facilities. This system was the cause of some of the issues that affected these sets on their introduction, but has since settled down to give reliable service.

The new coaches first made an



appearance in 2017, with the initial five off the production line being taken to the Velim test track in Czechoslovakia, where they were put through their paces before being exported to this country. Arriving in January 2019, they were based at Polmadie depot in Scotland. Introduction to service began on the London to Edinburgh and Glasgow service in April 2019 and the whole fleet was in operation by October of that year, allowing it to be used on all the other routes, which currently comprise London to Edinburgh, Glasgow, Fort William, Aberdeen and Inverness.

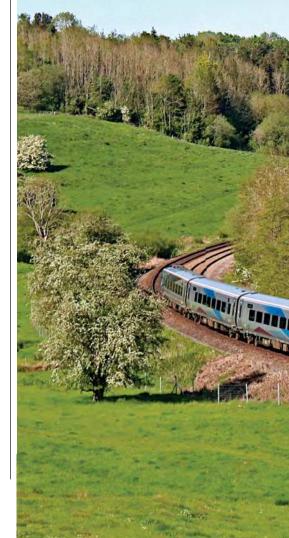
ENGLISH ORDERS

Shortly after the order was placed for the Caledonian sleeper vehicles, CAF won a substantial order from Eversholt Rail to supply Northern Rail with new DMUs and EMUs, followed by a further order to supply EMUs and locomotive-hauled coaches for the TransPennine franchise. CAF was able to offer a competitive price for the locomotive-hauled vehicles as it proposed to piggyback the order onto the back of the Scottish vehicles, which were then in production. As a result, the coaches were built to the same length as the earlier vehicles but are actually a fraction narrower due to gauging requirements, and as such are often referred to as Mk 5a.

As the assembly line was already available, production of the TransPennine sets was rapid and the first one was available for tests at Velim in March 2018, after which it was transported to Portbury Docks near Bristol where it was inspected and checked over before being dispatched for running in on the West Coast Main Line, with these operations commencing in October 2018.

The first set was officially handed over to TransPennine in April 2019 following a period of fault-free running, following which they were introduced on the Liverpool to Scarborough route, powered by Class 68 diesel locomotives from November that year. Their normal route was later altered so they served Redcar rather than Scarborough due to complaints about noise from the diesel locomotives affecting residents near the station and stabling point.

The TransPennine sets consist of four seated passenger vehicles, with one of these being a First Class coach with catering facilities and, unusually, the final one being a Driving Trailer which includes passenger accommodation. A total of 66 coaches were built, with these being formed up into 13 five-coach sets, with one Driving Trailer spare. First Class accommodation is in 2+1 form while Standard Class coaches have 2+2 seating with a mixture of airline and table seating being provided. The catering facility is installed at one end of the First Class coach, with this part of the train permanently marshalled against the locomotive, and thus not being provided with a corridor connection.





DESIGN TWEAKS

In a change from the sleeper vehicles, the TransPennine Mark 5s are equipped with inter-bar coach couplers with buckeye couplings and buffers only provided at the outer ends of sets. The Driving Trailer uses much of the technology from CAF's multiple units, but the cab is laid out so the controls are similar to those provided in the Class 68 which powers the train. All passenger accommodation in these vehicles is Standard Class. Many of the components are the same as the Scottish vehicles and they are fitted with the same bogies, braking systems, doors, gangways, air conditioning equipment and toilets.

Mk 5 coaches can be found working two services in each direction between

London and Scotland each night, six days a week, with services split and combined at Edinburgh or Carstairs. Depending on the season, these can load to 16 vehicles for the main leg of the journey, hauled by Class 92 electric locomotives for this section. Further north, rebuilt Class 73s are used on formations that range from four to six coaches to Fort William and Aberdeen and up to eight for Inverness. This can mean that up to 64 of the 75-strong Scottish fleet is active on any one day.

TransPennine uses its Mk 5s rather less intensively and often will field only three or four sets of five coaches each day, with traction provided by Direct Rail Services (DRS) Class 68s in matching

TransPennine Express livery. However, other locomotives in other liveries have been seen covering for their dedicated classmates as required.

These Mk 5 sets offer a number of interesting modelling possibilities. The TransPennine sets are relatively short and well within the lengths most layouts can cope with while the portions of the sleeper trains that run north of the Borders are of a length that again would suit a typical layout. The appearance of new locomotive-hauled stock is a welcome change for what has become a largely unit-dominated railway, and the availability of ready-to-run models offers modern image modellers the chance to update their layouts to represent the introduction of these

First introduced in the 1990s as air-braked replacements for British Rail's veteran fleet of engineers' ballast/spoil wagons, the ZCAs were converted from a series of redundant departmental and revenue stock.

These conversions made use of former OBA wooden-bodied open wagons, VDA and VBA vans, as well as OAA, SPA and VCA vehicles in later years. Conversions continued into the privatisation era with English Welsh & Scottish







Railway (EWS) adding to the fleet. As a result, there were many detail differences between conversions, especially to the bodyside ribs on the new low-height steel bodies. These vary from five to 11 examples on each side.

EFE Rail's new 'OO' gauge model of the 'Sea Urchin' is based on one of the later privatisation era SPA wagon conversion and utilises the chassis from the existing BR SPA steel plate wagon, originally tooled by FTG Models. Six models form this batch of 'Sea Urchins' finished as DC460915 in pristine EWS maroon (Cat No: E87018), DC460387 in EWS maroon with light weathering (E87019),

DC460164 in EWS maroon with heavy weathering (E87020), 460006 in DB Schenker (ex-EWS) maroon (E87021), 460887 in DB Schenker (ex-EWS) maroon with light weathering (E87022) and 460503 in DB Schenker (ex-EWS) maroon with heavy weathering (E87033).

This latest iteration features a newly-tooled body moulding married to the original SPA wagon chassis, with our review sample measuring 154mm over buffers, 138mm over headstocks and 35mm wide (ends). Nine bodyside ribs feature on each side, while tiny separately-applied grab handles appear at the extreme righthand end on each side, together

with end strengthening ribs and representation of the triangular metal capping along the top edges. Lamp irons are moulded at each end.

Decoration to our heavily weathered review sample of 460503 in DB Schenker branded livery was very well done with a work-weary 'patchy' paintwork effect to the underlying EWS maroon and gold base colours, along with an overall weathered finish to the exterior and wagon interior. Lettering is neatly applied, as are the DB Schenker labels with black backgrounds which obliterate the previous EWS identity. Small printed details are also just

discernible on the solebar, while brake levers and steps are picked out in white (and weathered).

As with the SPA wagon, the axleboxes are articulated to provide sufficient play for the wagon to negotiate model railway curves and if you plan to change the supplied small tension lock couplings on this model for an alternative type you will need to consider changing the NEM pocket mechanism too, as these are not a standard size on this model. Weathered turned metal wheels complete the package.

Another useful air-braked engineers' wagon to bolster the departmental rolling stock roster. (MC)



New from Rails of Sheffield are these exclusive 'OO' gauge JIA 'Polybulk' bogie covered hopper wagons commissioned from Bachmann.

Built in the mid-1970s by French rolling stock manufacturer Fauvet Girel, these distinctive covered hopper wagons were employed on a variety of traffic across the UK and to/from Europe. Payloads included lime, sand, china clay and more.

Bachmann first introduced its new 'OO' gauge model in late 2013 (HM80), although there have been few releases since then. That is until now, as Rails of Sheffield has commissioned the manufacturer to produce two exclusive models of the vehicles finished as 21RIV70BR0999-011-9 in TIGER-NACCO branded grey and green (Cat No. 32-428Z) and 33RIV87SNCF5699023-4 in plain grey with TIGER and NACCO labels (32-429Z).

Weighing in at 90g each, these latest arrivals feature the same high level of detail with separately applied handrails, ladders, guard rails, etched walkway, handbrake wheels, lamp irons, buffer rungs, discharge chute wheels and anchor points, as well as neatly moulded pipework and hood opening mechanism and equipment. Underneath, detailing includes discharge chutes and

brake cylinders.

Decoration to our review samples was superb with each reflecting the prototypical colour schemes well – the TIGER-NACCO branded grey and green from the early 1980s and the plain grey scheme with separate TIGER and NACCO branding which they carried in later life (this latter model reflecting the 1990s period with BR style overhead electrification flashes that lasted until the mid-to-late 1990s). The roof walkway is silvered on each, while hand wheels, guard rails, buffer rungs, lamp irons, anchor points, lifting points and axleboxes are picked out in appropriate colours (white/yellow).

As with the original releases, each features a wealth of superbly printed lettering and labelling – some of which includes trilingual English/French/German instructions – printed on the hood opening mechanism at one end. Neatly printed train ferry labels, together with TIGER/NACCO branding, instructions and compartment lettering (A-E) also feature.

Darkened metal buffer heads, turned metal plain disc wheels and small tension lock couplings in NEM coupler pockets provide the finishing touches to what is another fine release. Excellent and available now. (MC)

HE MODERN RAILWAY
is filled with multiple
units, but there are
still daily locomotive
hauled passenger trains with
one of the most distinctive being
TransPennine Express' (TPE)
Class 68-hauled Nova 3 sets.

These trains were introduced in 2019 with construction of the Mk 5 coaches taking place in 2017-2018 by CAF in Spain. They run in fixed formations on the Liverpool-Scarborough corridor in push-pull form with a Class 68 Bo-Bo diesel-electric. Not only do these trains stand out; the Class 68s make a brilliant sound as well.

Accurascale revealed it would be producing ready-to-run 'OO' gauge models of the Nova 3 Mk 5a carriages in February 2019 and now the wait is finally over. The first production run has already sold out but we couldn't pass up the opportunity to give them a once-over.

Two five-car packs have been produced by Accurascale which model a complete TPE formation consisting of a Driving Trailer, three Trailer Standards and one Trailer First. Presentation is excellent with the outer packaging

particularly well designed. Inside is a two-part plastic tray which holds the models snugly between foam lining.

Once you take these coaches out of the box, they are even more impressive. The quality of the livery application is outstanding for such a complex scheme while the beauty is far greater than first appearances. Look closer and you will see individual printing in all the places you would expect and many that you wouldn't.

The shaping of the Driving Trailer is spot-on for the real vehicles and it has sprung buffers as well as impressively fine etched components. The destination panel is a separate part allowing modellers to choose the direction of travel for their train while the same process is applied to the side-mounted destination boards. Take care when fitting to avoid glue marks.

Moving along the train, the three Trailer Standards are all presented to the highest standard while the Trailer First has the correct end details to allow it to couple to a Class 68.

Lighting works on analogue and DCC layouts from the box

although a decoder is needed to power the directional lights on the Driving Trailer. The interior lights are switched by a magnetic 'wand' which activates a switch in the roof of each coach to turn the lights on and off.

Couplings between the coaches are magnetic and offer gap-free running between the gangways on straight track while the Kinematic design of the coupling mount means they can still run around second radius curves.

The magnetic couplings also aid push-pull operation, though for the best performance we would change the tension lock between leading coach and the locomotive for either a straight bar or similar magnetic design as tension locks have a tendency to override one another during propelling moves. Also worth looking at are the

underframe fittings – and not just the unusual inside frame bogies. There are many separately fitted parts in the underframe which create a real high definition finish to these 'OO' gauge carriages.

The new Accurascale Mk 5a Nova 3 sets are an outstanding addition to its 'OO' gauge range – and even better in our view than the Mk 5 sleeper coaches. The lighting features, magnetic couplings, gapfree running and impressive livery all make these a train pack that we really want to extend a collection. Given their early popularity, surely there will be a second production run. Let's hope so! (MW)

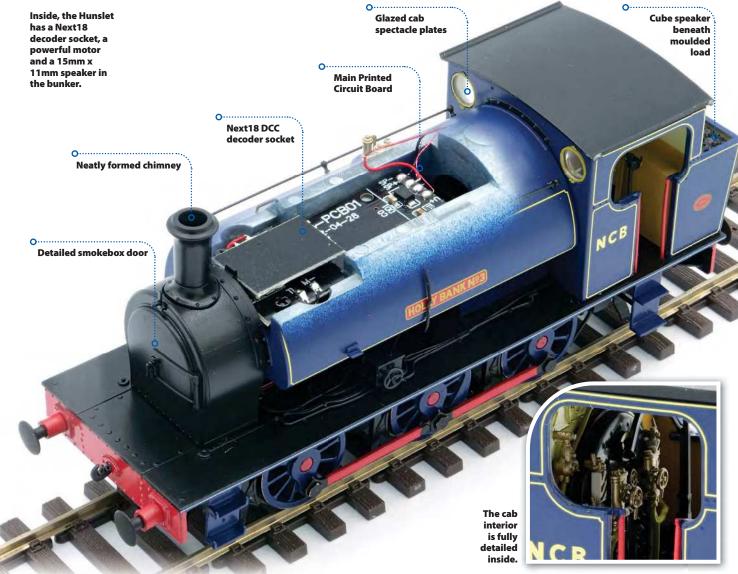

Nine of the 16in design have survived into preservation with one of the best known being *Ring Haw* which worked at Nassington Quarry – it is now located at the North Norfolk Railway.

THE MODEL

Seven versions of the new Hunslet are available from Rapido Trains and its stockists offering the locomotive in a range of attractive industrial colour schemes including blue, red, green and black finished off with unique names, markings and locomotive numbers.

The specification calls for a Next18 decoder socket, NEM coupling pockets, turned metal wheels, sprung buffers and use of diecast construction to increase the model's weight.

Our review sample was the highly popular National Coal Board blue liveried example finished as *Holly Bank No. 3.* The locomotive was completed in 1953 as works number 3783 and it is modelled as it is currently preserved at the Chasewater Steam Railway.

Decoration of the model is excellent with clean application of

the striking NCB blue base colour topped with neat cream lining, printed nameplates, NCB lettering on the cabside and worksplates on the bunker. The cab interior is fully detailed too with excellent physical and painted features.

Externally, the specification set out by Rapido has been followed superbly with the 16in Hunslet modelled accurately and with numerous separately fitted parts including pipework, safety valves, chimney, handrails, lubricator box and handle, reversing rod, brake shows and more. There are also sprung buffers while the wheels are very well finished too.

However, wonderful as this model is to behold, we did find a couple of parts to be a little fragile – in fact, we actually knocked two parts off during handling which is an unusual event. Firstly, the pipe from the dome running down the side of the saddle tank is very fine plastic, but in removing the tank for access to the decoder we managed to snap this part. That's entirely our fault, but it does show a little delicacy in this area. Secondly, we also dislodged one of the cab handrails – an easy fix, but frustrating nonetheless.

PERFORMANCE

The Hunslet is equipped with a modern specification motor and electronic components. The motor is fitted inside the die-cast lower saddle tank structure beneath a Next18 DCC decoder socket while there is also a 15mm x 11mm cube speaker concealed neatly in the bunker to make this a simple locomotive to upgrade to digital

sound if you haven't chosen the factory sound fitted version.

On track, our sample ran smoothly and quietly throughout the speed range. After following the instructions and running the model in for 30 minutes in each direction light engine, we subjected our sample to loaded test runs. 20 wagons were no match for this powerful little locomotive - making it highly capable for shunting at a large NCB complex.

OVERALL

The arrival of the Hunslet 16in 0-6-0ST is excellent news for industrial modellers and those looking to add an industrial connection to a main line railway. Its detail is excellent, as are its running qualities, and we can see new owners being very pleased with their purchases.

For Rapido, this is another exciting step in the development of its UK model business and a sign of the future for the arrival of its next locomotive - the GWR '1501' 0-6-0PT. On the basis of the Hunslet, our appetite is firmly whetted. (MW)

EFE Rail'S L S WR REVIEW CROSS-COUNTRY COACHES EFE Rail has added a new set of 'OO' gauge LSWR coaches to its range. MARK CHIVERS inspects these latest arrivals.



FE RAIL'S newly-tooled 'OO' gauge London & South Western Railway (LSWR)
Drummond cross-country three-car carriage sets have arrived.
Built at the LSWR's Eastleigh carriage works between 1906 and 1910, 36 cross-country sets were formed utilising a mix of 56ft non-corridor four-compartment Brake Thirds, seven-compartment Composites and eight-compartment Third Class vehicles.

They were used on services across the south western section of LSWR/SR/BR (SR) territory.

The Southern Railway (SR) operated much of its locomotive-hauled stock in fixed vehicle sets, adding additional sets to make up specific train formations, and also held a series of spare vehicles for use to complete and strengthen formations when required. At various points in their service careers, these LSWR cross-country sets ranged from three to ten cars in length.

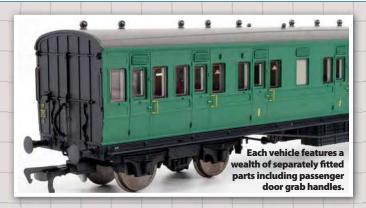
THE MODEL

Presented in a high-quality bookset style box with magnetic flip top, EFE Rail's newly-tooled vehicles represent stock formed up as three-car sets comprising one Composite (C) and two Brake Third (BT) vehicles. The company has produced three triple-coach packs initially to represent sets through the years and include Southern Railway (SR) Set 253 (BTs 2925/2929 and C 5056) in SR malachite green (Cat No. E86013), BR Southern Region (BR (SR)) Set 130 (BTs S2953/ S2955 and C S5041) in BR crimson (E86014) and BR (SR) Set 314 (BTs S2679(sic)/S2981 and C S5043) in BR (SR) malachite green (E86015).

Our review sample represents a later BR era Set 314 in post-war malachite green with Southern Region 'S' prefixes to the running numbers, reflecting the set as it operated from nationalisation onwards. It contains a Diagram 274 non-corridor Composite with lavatory (S5043) built at Eastleigh in 1907 and two Diagram 124 non-corridor Brake Thirds with lavatory (S2679 and S2981), also built at Eastleigh in 1907. However, it appears that an error may have crept in during production of S2679, as official records suggest this should be numbered S2979, which operated within the set at this time. Set 314 remained in service until around mid-1957 when it was withdrawn. The Brake Thirds were taken out of service during June and the Composite

later that summer.

EFE Rail's delightful new carriages certainly capture the appearance of the prototypes well and feature a wealth of separately-fitted detailing including exquisite passenger and guard's door grab handles, fine metal handrails, roof ventilators, vehicle end pipework, roof grab handles and impressive underframe and bogie detailing. Moulded detail is equally impressive with neatly formed panel lines, door ventilators, hinges, door stops, buffers and footboards.

The interiors are also neatly detailed with seating picked out in different colours in Third and First

Class areas. The interior moulding also includes access to the lavatory areas, as appropriate. Adding to the quality appearance, the guard's lookout is also glazed.

PERFORMANCE

Decoration is superb throughout with an evenly applied matt malachite green paint finish to the bodysides, black ends and grey roof. Lettering and numbers are crisp and legible – including the solebar set numbers and end panel data plates. Lavatory windows feature a neatly frosted appearance, while the glazing to the compartment areas is also

commendably flush. As a reminder of different times, the glazing also features Smoking and No Smoking signs, where appropriate, while the door locks and grab handles are neatly picked out with brass coloured paint. Set numbers are printed at the outer ends of the Brake Third vehicles.

Measuring 223mm over headstocks/236mm over buffers and weighing in at 120g (Brake Third) and 127g (Composite) respectively, the vehicles are neatly appointed underneath with brake mechanism equipment and pipework, battery boxes, cylinders, trusses and even wooden planking detail, along with separately fitted vacuum pipes which extend beneath the buffer beam at each end. Finely moulded steps feature at one end of each vehicle and conduit at the other. The bogies also look the part with well defined spring and axlebox cover detail, together with brake shoes in line with the turned metal disc wheels. Small tension lock couplings are fitted to self-centring kinematic sprung NEM coupler pockets.

OVERALL

As with some other models released within the EFE Rail 'OO' gauge range, these models bear their Kernow Model Rail Centre parentage underneath and will certainly complement the previously released LSWR 'Gate Stock', also offered through the EFE Rail range. A super new set of vehicles which plugs another gap in Southern outline rolling stock for 'OO' modellers. (MC)





eagerly awaited 'OO' gauge Great Western Railway (GWR) 25ton 'Loriot Y' two-axle machinery truck. Built in the late 1930s at the GWR's Swindon Works, just two 'Loriot Y' vehicles were completed, intended for use carrying heavy engineers' machinery. A development of previous similar wagon designs, these particular Diagram G39

vehicles differed in that they were constructed from I-beam girders and were slightly longer than the earlier 'Loriot' examples. They featured a deep well with low slung platform to ease loading and unloading at just above rail height.

Hornby's newly-tooled 'OO' gauge models reflect both prototypes finished as 41989 in GWR grey (Cat No. R60100) and DW41990 in BR grey (R60101) - this latter model representing the sole surviving prototype that lasted in BR use until 1990 and which is now preserved at the Severn Valley Railway.

is a weighty affair tipping the scales at 58g thanks to its mainly die-cast metal construction. The central 'wooden' decking is a plastic component, while the axlebox,

spring and distinctive brake gear detail at each end is also a separate plastic section fixed to the diecast chassis. Metal sheet forms the decking above the wheels.

Measuring 128mm over headstocks (32ft) by 34mm wide (8.5ft) with 104mm wheelbase (26ft), detailing is very good, with neatly fashioned girders to each side of the wagon well, together with a wealth of rivet heads and moulded securing shackles

Application of the BR plain grey is excellent with a high quality paint finish, relieved by a dark brown wood appearance to the decking with effective variation of the tone on the planking. While the wagon appears to have changed little through the years, the printed detail on the side includes TOPS code ZXP with 'Empty to CCE plant yard Radyr' lettering, along with

overhead live wire flashes on the girders forming the well. Running numbers, builder's plates, tare details and data panels are also neatly printed, while the distinctive brake levers are picked out in white. Self contained buffers are fitted at each corner, while underneath, NEM sockets are screwed to the underside of the end deck plates

and provide a degree of sideplay for the small tension lock couplings, although these are not selfcentring. Turned metal spoked wheels complete the package. Hornby's new 'OO' gauge 'Loriot Y' is a super new addition to the range providing a distinct, yet very useful departmental wagon which is sure to prove popular. (MC)

Underneath, the decking is secured to the chassis with two screws. Straight from the box, the model Hornby's eagerlyawaited 'OO' gauge GWR 'Loriot Y' is now available.

Steadfast Class 60

ORNBY'S high-fidelity
'OO' gauge Class 60 gains
a new identity for its
latest release as first-built
60001 Steadfast in BR Railfreight
Construction sector livery.

Designed by Brush Traction at Loughborough, 100 Class 60s were built for British Rail's freight sector businesses, although by the time they entered service shadow privatisation of freight operations was looming.

The first locomotive – 60001 – was released in June 1989, but a protracted testing and commissioning phase for the class led to a significant delay to service entry.

Hornby's latest release models 60001 *Steadfast*, which was introduced to service in August 1991. Its initial allocation was to Stewart's Lane depot in South London.

The model features a heavy diecast chassis, five-pole skew-wound motor, twin flywheels, all-wheel drive and also benefits from a new 21-pin Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder socket. 60001 also includes a detailed cab interior,

opening cab doors, sprung metal buffers, see through etched metal grilles (with detailed engine room components) and directional lighting, with a choice of day or night settings.

Decoration is up to Hornby's usual high standard with an excellent triple grey paint finish, metallic grey exhaust silencer, orange cantrail safety stripe and Railfreight Construction sector logos on the bodyside with repeaters alongside the driver's assistant's side doors. As with the real thing it carries the oast house depot plaques of Hither Green, despite being allocated to Stewarts Lane, and also features neatly printed *Steadfast* nameplates which it carried from entry until late September 1996. However, the running numbers on our sample didn't look quite right – perhaps a tad smaller than they appeared on

the real thing.

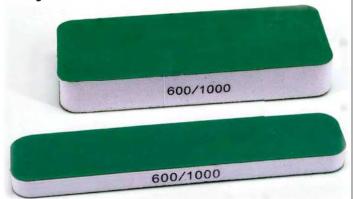

The first of Hornby's new magnetic couplings are now available in multi-coupling packs.

Our review samples included examples of the 17mm (R7399) and 20mm (R7400) vacuum pipe packs. Each contains eight pairs of couplings designed to replace standard small tension lock versions and are suitable for use with compatible 'OO' gauge locomotives, carriages and wagons fitted with NEM pockets.

The real benefit of these new items is that they provide a more realistic appearance between vehicles when coupled together, than the traditional tension lock

couplings. Each coupling features two small circular magnets at the coupling end, together with the standard NEM clip at the other. When coupled together the moulded pipes appear to be linked between vehicles and also offer closer coupling.

Two lengths of vacuum pipe magnetic couplings are available - 17mm and 20mm - depending on the coupling distance between vehicles. Our review samples demonstrated a strong bond when coupled together and also helped reduce the level of bounce that tension lock couplings can suffer. A handy upgrade. (JN)

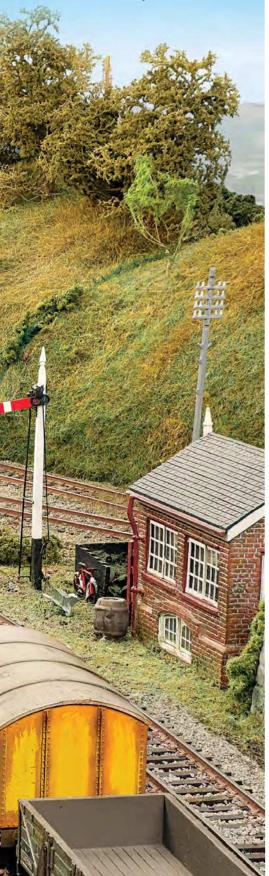

The sleepy railway byways of Buckinghamshire are the subject of Three Counties Model Railway Society's atmospheric 'OO' gauge layout. **WILLIAM THOMAS** explains how it was built and operates.

STONBURY JUNCTION depicts a secondary London, Midland and Scottish Railway (LMS) line in the 1960s, running from rural Crafton in Buckinghamshire to Oving with a branch line to Dunton. At 20ft x 21in, the layout has been designed to allow a three-coach passenger train plus locomotive to operate comfortably. Despite being analogue controlled, much can still be achieved with two trains departing the station simultaneously.

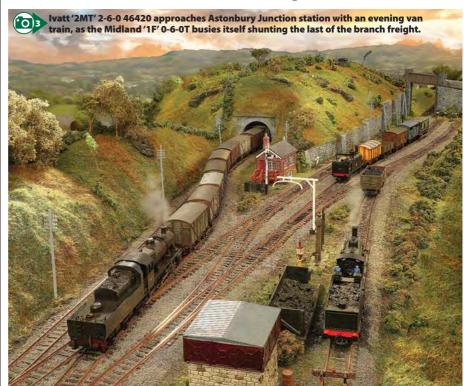
Astonbury Junction was inspired by Broom Junction, part of the former Evesham and Redditch Railway, which opened on June 2 1869 and has appeared at a selection of model railway exhibitions in recent times including Silver Fox Model Railway Club's (MRC's) 2019 and 2022 shows, Luton MRC's event in 2018 and Rosten MRC's 2019 exhibition.

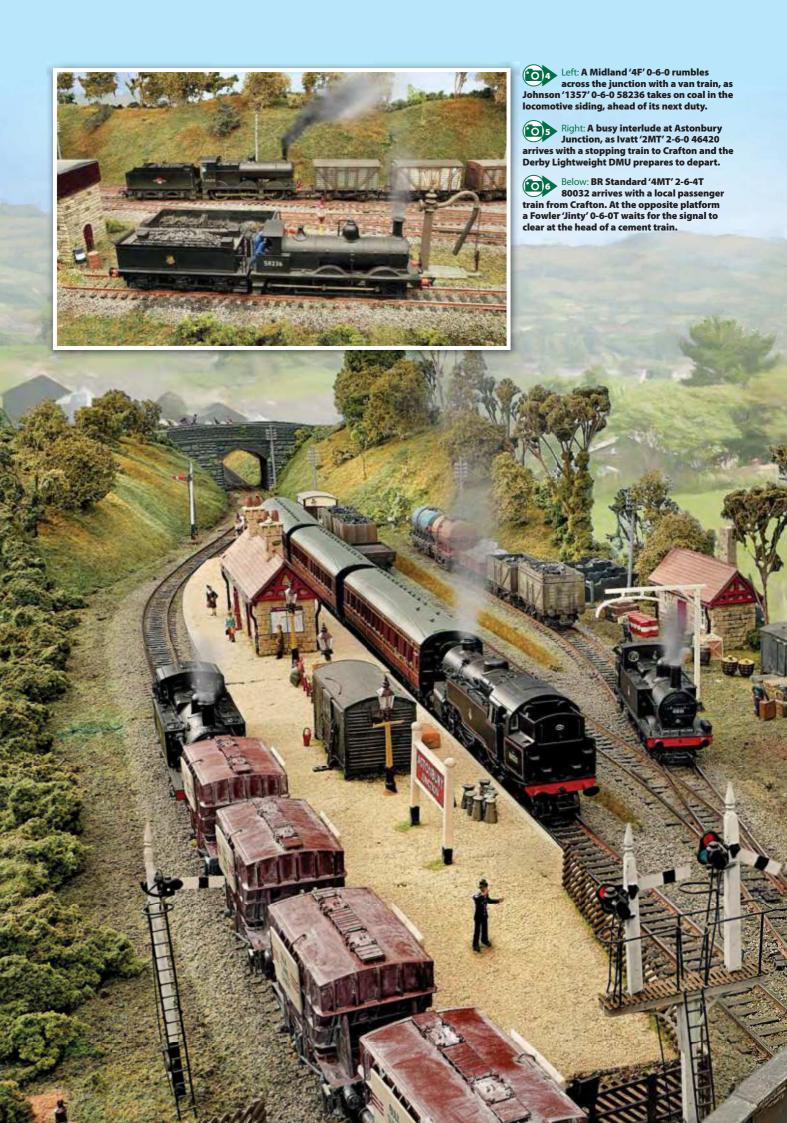
CONSTRUCTION

Astonbury Junction's baseboards are constructed from birch plywood frames with diagonal cross-members and covered in birch plywood sheeting. There are five 4ft x 21in baseboards which accommodate the scenic section and storage yards at each end. All track and ballast was laid on a cork base to quieten the sound of trains running on plain wood, and also helps in creating the basis of a ballast 'shoulder', to replicate the real thing.

All trackwork is Peco Streamline and all the turnouts are live frog examples, as reliability was paramount, especially for exhibition use. Once this was laid, we started to run trains almost immediately so we could check the electrics, running characteristics and ensure the layout operated as we had intended.

One of the most interesting aspects of the layout is the point where the branch line diverges, as the main line train heads.







left and disappears into the tunnel while the branch line train can still be seen as it heads straight on under the bridge towards the storage yard. Fundamental to this junction is the diamond crossing at its centre. Initially a code 100 diamond crossing was installed but this was replaced with a code 75 version before the scenery was developed.

Following issues with the originally-installed point motors, we retrofitted each of the turnouts with servo motors. These servos together with a set of Model Electronics Railway Group (MERG)
Servo4 control kits have proved extremely reliable. The layout also benefits from LMS scratchbuilt signals made by one of our club members. These are also operated by similar servos located under the layout, providing smooth movement of the signal arm.

The framework for the scenery was mainly constructed from extruded polystyrene blocks covered in plaster bandages, decorated with a mixture of woodland scenic trees, static grass, and foliage.

OPERATION

Astonbury Junction is controlled using a Gaugemaster Model W analogue controller for the central operator with a Gaugemaster feedback controller for each storage yard. A minimum of three operators is required for the running of the layout at an exhibition.

As it is an end-to-end operation, there are two storage yards, so one operator is required for each of these and another for the central control panel. When the layout)

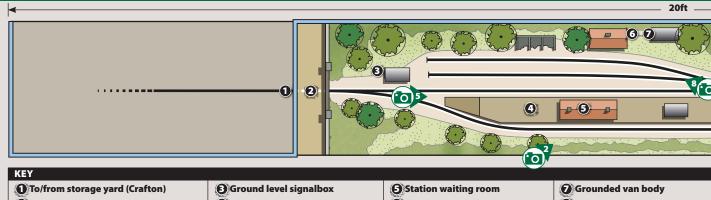

ASTONBURY JUNCTION TRACK DIAGRAM (NOT TO SCALE)



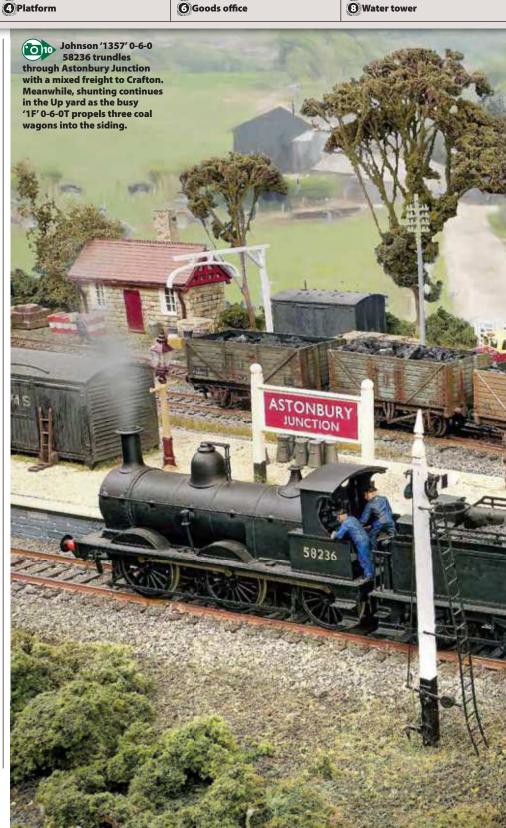
bring their own motive power to bolster the roster during running sessions. As a result, an impressive array of 'OO' gauge motive power has been amassed including a Fowler 'Jinty' 0-6-0T, Ivatt '2MT' 2-6-4T, Ivatt '2MT' 2-6-0, Hughes 'Crab' 2-6-0, Midland '1F' 0-6-0T, Midland '4F' 0-6-0, Johnson '1357' 0-6-0, Johnson '3F' 0-6-0, BR Standard '4MT' 2-6-4T, Class 24 Bo-Bo diesel, LMS pioneer diesel 10001, DMUs and more.

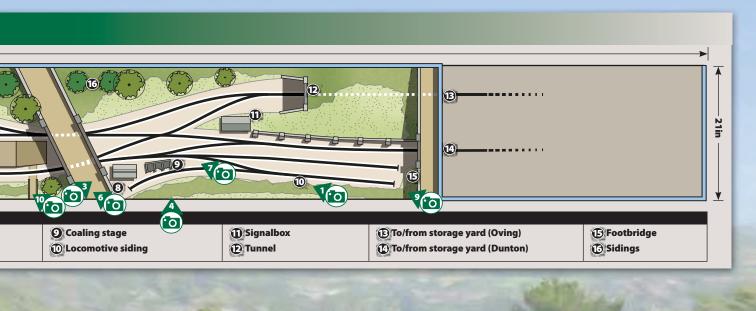
FINALLY

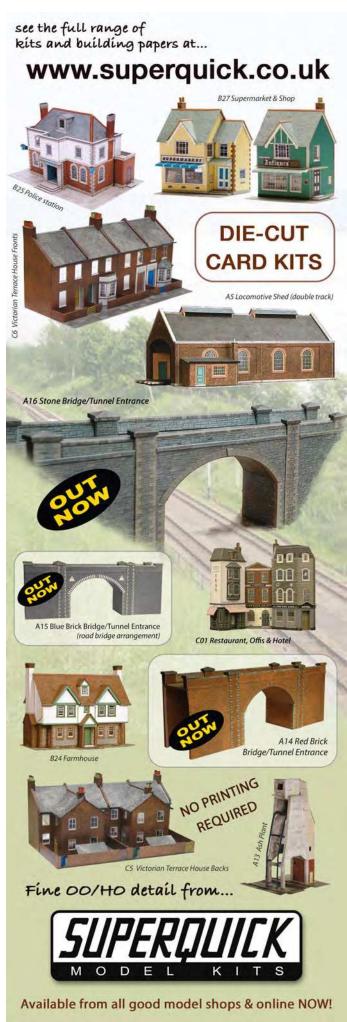

Beeching was the man who single-handedly

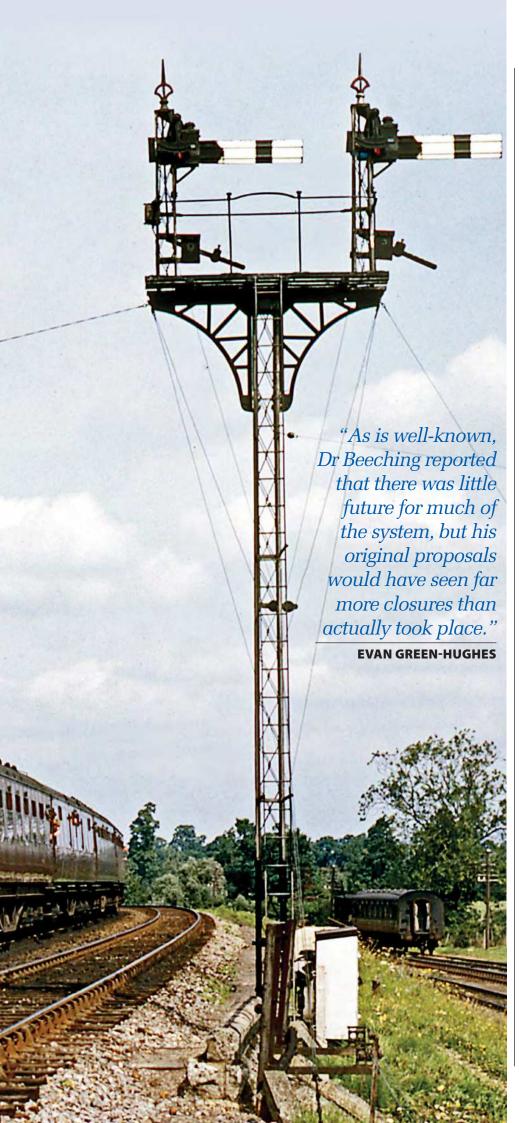
Many people speak as if Dr Beeching was the man who single-handedly destroyed our railway system. In reality, he was merely the culmination of a process that had been under way for more than half a century. **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** delves into the background of route closures.

HEN, in 1963, the notorious Reshaping of British Railways report was published, it sent shockwaves throughout the nation. Every national newspaper carried a full-page list of all the stations that were to be closed and the public was incensed.

Campaigns were mounted, protests were held and MPs were lobbied but all to no avail, with the result that around 4,500 route-miles of railway, about a third of the country's total, was lost. Ever since then the term 'the Beeching Axe' has come to be used when referring to the closure of any railway, whether or not the Doctor had any input to that actual site.

Railways were promoted at a time when the only other method of transport was the horse and cart, or if you were lucky enough to live near one, a canal. Getting from one place to another was a painfully slow and expensive business, while the transport of goods was almost impossible other than by coastal ship or inland waterway.

DUPLICATION

The arrival of the railways in the first quarter of the 19th century changed all that and caused not only a massive expansion of the economy but also in the social mobility of the population which now found it easier and cheaper to travel. Money poured into the railway companies and there was a boom in construction that left almost no part of the country without a service.

Unfortunately, due to the fragmented way that the network was developed, many of the lines that were built competed with each other, while others were built to serve places where the only traffic available was an abundant quantity of optimism.

Improved transport and communications enabled large cities and towns to expand massively, leading in turn to further demand for the railways, as materials and foodstuffs were transported in and out while commuting became an established part of British life as the better-off deserted the city centres for a new house in the suburbs.

The railway companies had it all their own way for several decades but the first sign of trouble came with the arrival of the electric tram, in Brighton, in 1883. These new-fangled devices were clean, fast and cheap and furthermore they offered the prospect of a virtual door to door service that did not involve a walk to the nearest railway station. By 1901 trams had arrived in London and within a few years every town and city of any size had a tramway system.

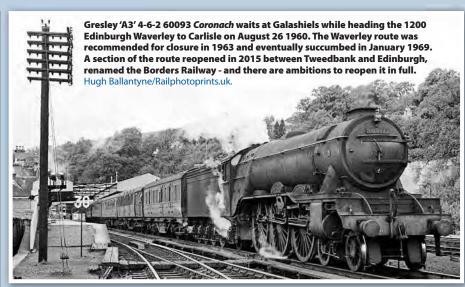
Trams hit passenger traffic on the suburban railways very hard, particularly on short journeys, and while some companies, particularly in Lancashire and in the south of England, tried to compete by installing their own electrified systems, passenger numbers declined dramatically. However, in the countryside, the railways still enjoyed a monopoly, for there no realistic alternatives existed.

RAILWAY REALISM

The second big blow came at the end of the First World War in 1918 when the Government of the day decided to dispose of a large amount of ex-military surplus at rock-bottom prices, with this including a huge number of lorries. Ex-servicemen who had been trained to drive during the conflict purchased such vehicles and set up in the haulage business, many of them in the very rural areas in which the railways still had a monopoly. Some also converted vehicles so that they would be suitable for carrying passengers, and used them to bring bus services to areas where formerly the railway was the only mode of public transport.

The Government also launched a programme of state-funded road improvements, primarily aimed to tackle high levels of unemployment, which eventually resulted in the creation of new bypasses and trunk roads, all of which made road transport a more practical proposal.

By this time the effects of the oversupply of railway lines and the underinvestment in repairs and renewals had begun to come to the fore, with the result that in 1923, the 120 or so independent companies were forcibly grouped together into four units which it was hoped would enable them to obtain sufficient capital to modernise and to compete with the growing threat from road transport. By this time around eight million tons of goods traffic per year had been lost to the roads, while passengers were deserting in their droves to use the new trams and buses.



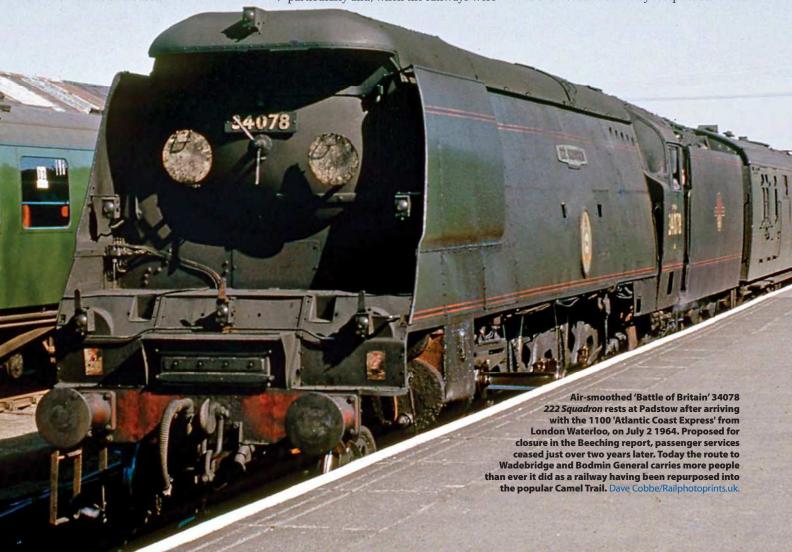
'BIG FOUR' REVIEW

One of the first reviews undertaken by the 'Big Four' companies was an examination of the lines they now controlled. Some of these duplicated each other while others carried such sparse traffic that they would never be profitable. Between 1923 and 1939 around 1,300 miles of line were closed.

During the Second World War, the railways were busier than ever, and fuel shortages curtailed the activities of the road haulage industry, but after the war competition returned, only this time the road vehicles that were available were much improved. Serious inroads were made into traffic in rural areas particularly and, when the railways were

nationalised in 1948, the new British Transport Commission set up the Branch Lines Committee to examine the issue. Rather surprisingly, in view of the pledge that the state would be best-placed to protect the country's rail network, this committee was, between 1948 and 1962, responsible for the closure to passengers of around 3,300 miles of line, with the majority of it also closed to freight.

Despite the attack from the road haulage industry, railways continued to pay their way until 1953 when the system could not generate enough cash to pay its capital charges. Two years later it was not even able to generate enough money to pay its overheads. A strike by footplate staff

in the same year lost the railways a lot of business, some of it forever, while the Modernisation Plan which was an attempt to reduce some of the working costs, went very wrong, and failed to stem losses, which rose to £68m a year by 1960. Two years later this had risen to £104m a year and British Railways could no longer pay the interest on its loans without direct Government support.

Clearly losses could not be allowed to continue to spiral and as a result Prime Minister Harold Macmillan ordered that a review should be conducted with the object of making the railway system fit for purpose in the 20th century and he appointed Dr Richard Beeching to do just that. In fact, the remit was rather narrower than that presented to the public, as the Government was anxious to get rid of any liability to pay for a non-profitable railway system, and the idea that railways could be subsidised to serve a social purpose was not a part of any discussion.

As is well-known, Dr Beeching reported that there was little future for much of the system, but his original proposals would have seen far more closures than actually took place. This is because once other factors, such as the isolation of communities in the Scottish Highlands, were taken into consideration, the case for closure of some lines was much reduced. And it wasn't just isolated branch lines that were endangered either, with several main lines targeted including the Great Central, Somerset & Dorset and Waverley routes amongst the proposed closures.

In the event there was much toing and froing in the following years as politicians made the case for lines which ran through their constituencies to be retained, and it has to be said with some success, particularly in seats where the incumbent had a slender majority. Closures followed

at some rate over the following six years, with the Waverley Route between Edinburgh and Carlisle one of the last.

ARMAGEDDON AVERTED

Despite the closures British Railway's losses continued to mount and by 1982 had reached £933m a year. Again, the Prime Minister of the day, in this case Margaret Thatcher, commissioned a report with the Dr Beeching figure this time being Sir David Serpell.

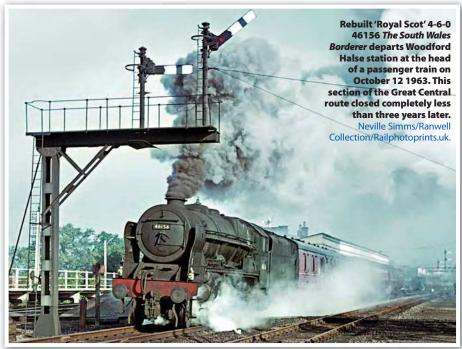
Options suggested included pruning the network until there was only about 2,000 miles left, saving costs by closing stations but retaining services or a selective closure of some routes and retaining facilities only where there was a town of 25,000 people or more. As might have been expected, the reaction from the public and the press was overwhelmingly against, while politicians expressed their opposition. The report was quietly buried and what became known as 'Beeching Mark 2' was avoided.

It is interesting to note that about half of the railways that have been closed in the last century were not closed by Beeching but by other groups or committees tasked with examining the same issue, namely the poor financial performance of the railway system. It is a quandary that is still with us today because the railway continues to be a heavy loss maker and is now supported by a series of grants, subsidies and financial input from regional transport authorities.

The latest initiative is the formation of Great British Railways which is a government company that is intended to streamline the railways and to save costs in the process. However, today the emphasis is on efficiency rather than retrenchment and it is likely that we have seen the end of closures such as those promoted by Dr Beeching 60 years ago. Surely no sane politician would want to be associated with that legacy any more.

British Railways The First 25 Years - J. Allan & A. Murray **Volume. 12: London Eastern Region**

This volume covers the Eastern Region lines from the terminus stations at King's Cross, Liverpool Street and Marylebone out along the main lines as far New Barnet, Ilford and Neasden respectively, the Metropolitan Widened Lines between King's Cross and Moorgate and the North London Line from Hackney to Canonbury. It also includes the former Great Eastern Railway branches to North Woolwich, Chingford, Enfield Town, Ongar and Palace Gates, and the ex-Great Northern Railway branch to Alexandra Palace. We visit the three principal motive power depots serving the former Great Northern Railway lines, King's Cross 'Top Shed', Hornsey and Finsbury Park, the massive complex that was the Great Eastern's Stratford Shed and Works, and the Great Central shed at Neasden. We also take in the freight traffic around the marshalling yards of Ferme Park and Temple Mills. All three termini saw extensive commuter traffic with 0-6-2Ts of different designs employed on the services from King's Cross and Liverpool. The Great Eastern Lazz' was the most intensive steam-worked suburban operation in the world. The Epping to Ongar line saw ancient 2-4-2Ts operating a push-pull service until it was electrified in 1957. Electrification came to the suburban lines from Liverpool Street in several stages, beginning in 1949 and completed in 1960 when the Jazz' was replaced by electric units. A mix of DMUs and locomotive-hauded trains took over at King's Cross. Dieselsation of main line services on both the Great Eastern and Great Northern lines began in 1958 and was complete by the end of 1963, whereas those on the Great Central ended in 1966 with run-down ex LM&SR 4-6-0s. King's Cross saw four different Type '2' diesel classes before standardisation on the Brush design. By the late 1960s the ubiquitous Brush Type '4' had become the core express motive power, supported on the Great Eastern by the English Electric Type '3' and in second place behind the small but iconic 'Deltic' fleet on the East Coast main line.

THE DUNDEE &

Arbroath Railway

The Dundee & Arbroath Railway, which opened for traffic in 1836, was the second of no fewer than

opening of the Tay Bridge brought it into the joint ownership of the Caledonian Railway and the North

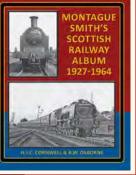

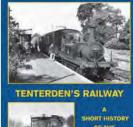
The late Montague Smith was a Scottish railway enthusiast who devoted much of his life to a study of the steam locomotive. His 'home territory' was in and around Glasgow and down the former Caledonian stretch of the West Coast Main Line as far as Beattock. In this book, we make our way from Glasgow Central to Symington, junction for the Peebles Branch on which 'Monty' took many photographs while holidaying in Biggar (the most important intermediate town on the branch) for the whole of August for many years. There he got to know many of the Carstairs enginemen who worked the branch and formed close and lasting friendships with a number of them. Day trips to Edinburgh, Stirling and Perth are also included and illustrate a mixture of former North British Railway and standard L&NER classes. Many of the photographs also identify the enginemen and other railway staff featured.
