2005 'Thane of Fife' was outshopped in August 1936. The engine would be fitted with the A4 style Bugatti nose and, unique to 2005, a single chimney. 'Thane of Fife' would continue in service as a P2 locomotive until January 1943, when it would become the first member of the class to be rebuilt into the controversial A2/2 Class by Edward Thompson. Continuing in service for another 16 years until withdrawal in November 1959 the locomotive would be swiftly scrapped.

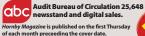

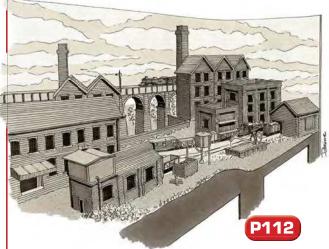

Over on www.keymodelworld.com you can now watch all four parts of our Building a Diesel Depot video series which follows the creation of Natford TMD.

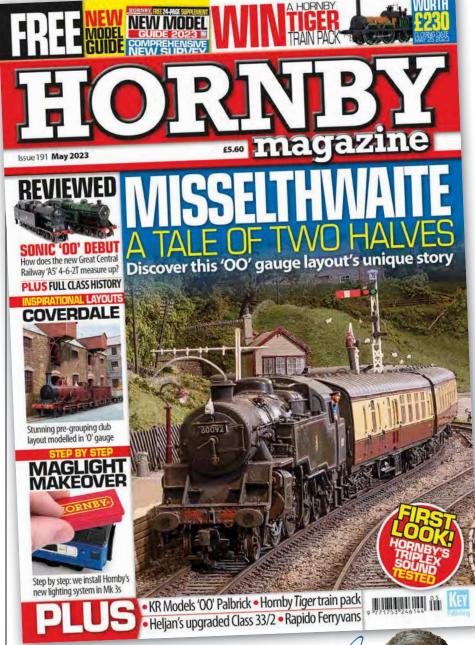

#### HORNBY REVEALS...

Hornby has revealed an exclusive Collector Club model of LNER 'P2' 2-8-2 2005 Thane of Fife for 'OO' gauge.

RESLEY'S streamlined 'P2' 2-8-2 2005 Thane of Fife has been selected as the next exclusive Hornby Collector Club model. The new 'OO' gauge release was revealed at Hornby's Virtual Collector Club day on March 25.

The new model of Thane of Fife models the Gresley 2-8-2 in original form with streamlined smokebox and it will carry LNER lined apple green livery depicting the locomotive as it was in service in Era 3 between delivery in 1936 and rebuilding as an 'A2/2' in 1943.

2005 was completed at Doncaster Works in 1936 and differed from the other 'P2s' as it was not fitted with a Kylchap double blastpipe. Like the rest of the 'P2s', the locomotive was based in Scotland to work heavy Edinburgh-Aberdeen expresses over the challenging route. In 1943,

2005 was selected for rebuilding by Edward Thompson as the first of the 'A2/2' 4-6-2s which saw the locomotive in service for another 16 years before final withdrawal in November 1959.

Release of the new model of 2005 Thane of Fife is expected in summer 2023 with the price set at £199.99. The specification incorporates NEM coupling pockets with small tension lock couplings, a 21-pin decoder socket, space for a speaker, a five-pole motor in the locomotive, turned metal buffers, locomotive-specific details and a new locomotive to tender power coupling.

Ordering opened at 10am on March 25 for Collector Club Members only.

OCOMOTION Models is marking the centenary of the world's most famous steam locomotive with an exclusive Hornby limited edition of Gresley 'A1' 4-6-2 4472 Flying Scotsman as it appeared at the 1924 British Empire Exhibition. February 24 2023 marked 100 years since the locomotive was completed at Doncaster Works and it later became the first steam locomotive to officially reach 100mph and also the first to circumnavigate the globe, touring in America and Australia.

The new model will form part of the National Collection in Miniature series and is set to be available from summer 2023 with orders open now through the Locomotion Models website.

The 1924 Empire Exhibition edition of *Flying Scotsman* (Cat No. R30295) will feature turned metal wheels, NEM coupling pockets, a 21-pin decoder socket, space for 28mm round speaker and a Locomotion Models has commissioned an exclusive Hornby 'OO' gauge model of Gresley 'A1' 4-6-2 4472 Flying Scotsman in 1924 British Empire Exhibition condition.



five-pole motor. It will also use Hornby's latest tooling for the Gresley 'Pacific' which incorporates a die-cast running plate on the locomotive as well as firebox flicker. Hornby Marketing and Development Director Simon Kohler said: "Quite a few years ago I managed to persuade my then CEO that Hornby should create a suite of tools that would allow us to produce as many variants of *Flying Scotsman* as possible. 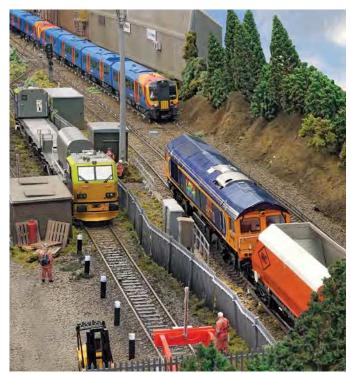

# KEY PUBLISHING AND PJM MODELS LASER-CUT GCR 'BIRDCAGE BRIDGE' KIT

Key Publishing and PJM Models have released their second kit – a 'OO' gauge lasercut model of the GCR 'Birdcage Bridge' which once crossed the WCML at Rugby.



EY PUBLISHING and PJM Models have released their second kit – a 'OO' gauge lasercut model of the GCR 'Birdcage Bridge' which once crossed the West Coast Main Line at Rugby.

This CAD-designed lasercut plywood and MDF kit was originally designed for Pete Waterman's Making Tracks 2 layout in 2022 (HM182) as a scenic break across the Rugby end of the layout, but is now being made available

World Shop with brand-new parts. The bridge will be available in two forms - bridge only without support walls and as a combined bridge and walls kit. All components are laser-cut and each kit comes with instructions.

The total size of the bridge is 435mm x 140mm. The total height is 83mm while the minimum height inside the bridge frame allows for a double track main line to be

installed with either code 75 or code 100 track.

The bridge support walls are cut from 4mm thick MDF and feature laser-engraved brick details. They have been created over-length allowing the bridge to be set square or skewed depending upon the layout design.

Prices for the GCR 'Birdcage Bridge' kits start at £64.99 for the bridge only and rise to £79.99 inclusive of a pair of support walls with full brick detail. Deluxe Materials Roket Rapid superglue is a suitable adhesive for assembly and builders will also need to supply paint to finish the structure.

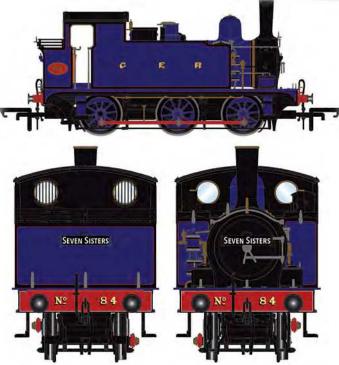
CCURASCALE is to produce the Great Eastern Railway 'J67'/J68'/J69'0-6-0T locomotives for 'OO' gauge.

Built between 1890 and 1901 at the Great Eastern Railway's (GER) Stratford Works, 140 'R24' 0-6-0Ts were constructed across 14 batches, with 100 built to passenger configuration and 40 to goods specification. Further builds, rebuilds and conversions resulted in 190 locomotives of various classifications and specifications collectively known as 'Buckjumpers' – a name applied to the class due to their lively running characteristics – by Grouping in 1923.

Under London and North Eastern Railway (LNER) tenure, these underwent a complex series of alterations and were reclassified 'J67', 'J68' and 'J69', remaining in regular use until the mid to late 1950s, with the last locomotive withdrawn in 1962. One example – 68633 – survives in preservation at Bressingham Museum.

The range will comprise five models initially, covering several of the important changes undergone by the classes between 1890 and 1962

Five different models are planned initially, including Great Eastern Railway (GER) No. 84 in GER lined blue.

GER 87 at Bressingham, has been undertaken to aid the development team in designing the all-new 'OO' gauge model. Variations include options for narrow and wide cabs, asymmetrical and symmetrical

doorways, alternative cab roof ellipses, narrow and wide bunkers, alternative coal rail fitting and differing side tank capacities and profiles.

The new models' specification

includes a die-cast metal chassis and boiler, factory fitted brake rigging, all-wheel pickup, smokebox mounted Next18 DCC decoder socket, stay-alive, fully detailed cab, removable magnetic roof, fully detailed bunker area and moveable roof ventilator.

Other features include separately fitted grab handles, steps, buffer beam pipework, lamp irons, brass turned whistles/valves, fully sprung metal buffers, factory-installed pipework, screw couplings and etched metal pre-painted number plates and plaques (where applicable).

### Rapido Trains UK plans 'OO' Met 'E' 0-4-4T

Rapido Trains UK is adding a Metropolitan Railway 'E' 0-4-4T to its 'OO' gauge range in a double celebration marking the 125th anniversary of sole survivor No. 1 and the 160th of the world's first underground railway.

Built in 1898 at Neasden Works, No. 1 worked the opening train on the Metropolitan Railway's Uxbridge branch on July 4 1904 and has been involved with a series of anniversary runs through the decades, including a central role in the 150th anniversary of the London Underground in January 2013 when it brought steam back to the network's tunnels for the first time since 1971.

The sole surviving 'E' features several detail differences from the main batch of locomotives, so Rapido is focusing attention on this locomotive in its London Transport and preserved state, together with one other similar class member.

Development of the newlytooled 'OO' gauge model of Met No. 1 is at an advanced state with an Engineering Prototype sample with the development team for assessment.



Four models are planned, finished as L.44 (Cat No. 909001) and L.48 (909002) in London Transport livery (909002), together with two preservation era colour schemes as No. 1 in 1999-2009 form (909003) and the Metropolitan livery it has carried since 2013 (909004).

The models will include a smooth, powerful mechanism, Next18 Digital Command Control (DCC) decoder socket, flickering firebox LED light and factory-fitted speaker as well as NEM coupling pockets. Digital sound-fitted models will also be available on release.

Priced at £179.95 DCC ready and £279.95 DCC sound-fitted, production is expected to start shortly with release expected in early 2024, Rapido having already received a sample for inspection.

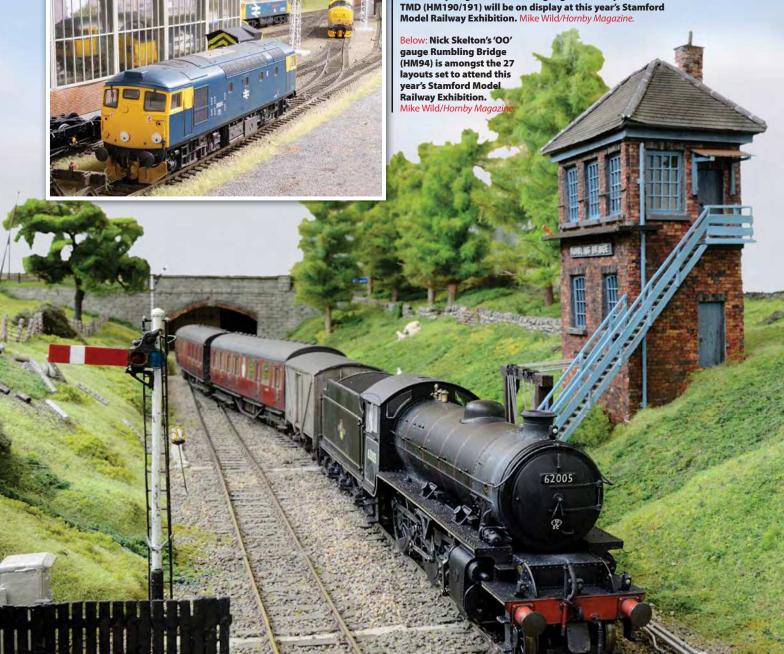
Market Deeping Model Railway Club's annual model railway exhibition returns in mid-May. **MARK CHIVERS** outlines some of the highlights of this year's show.

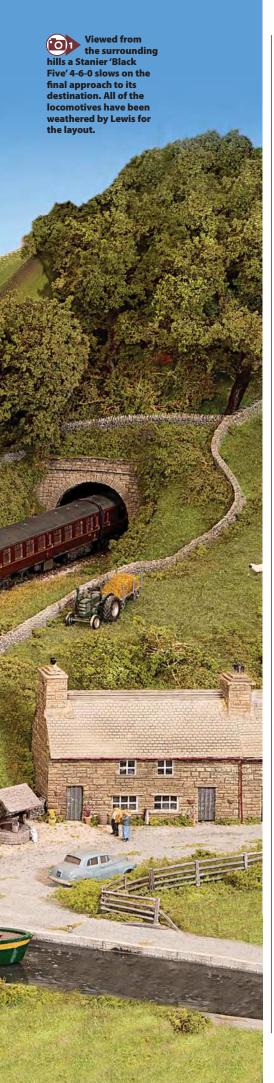

# To make the most of an inaccessible space in his new home, **LEWIS BUCKNELL** built

a 'OO' gauge layout set in the BR steam era in Yorkshire - to evocative effect.

N THEORY, as the average railway modeller progresses through life and works their way up the property ladder, they should hopefully have more space to build bigger and bigger layouts. I've experienced the opposite, at least for now. I built my first layout in my parent's loft whilst home from university on summer breaks (HM152), but upon graduating, getting a job, saving and eventually buying a house in 2021, the possibility of a new project dawned. Unfortunately, space for a model railway isn't really a top priority when buying a first home in this day and age - despite my valiant and persistent efforts to convince my partner otherwise. I knew that whatever house I ended up in, I'd have to be creative.

In the end I was able to build an L-shaped layout with a 16ft x 2ft scenic section and an 8ft non-scenic storage yard with three sidings capable of holding a locomotive and six coaches. The storage yard runs behind my desk out of sight and is accessible via a tunnel which acts as a scenic break.

The layout is six inches or so off the floor due to being built in a convenient alcove in a converted loft where the roof slopes down. It's one of those quirky spaces which I wouldn't have otherwise known what to do with, so installing a model railway here was the perfect solution. One disadvantage of having the layout so close to the floor is that my cocker spaniel can occasionally be found eating the odd 4mm scale sheep or licking the roof of a cottage. Fortunately, he doesn't take too much interest in it.

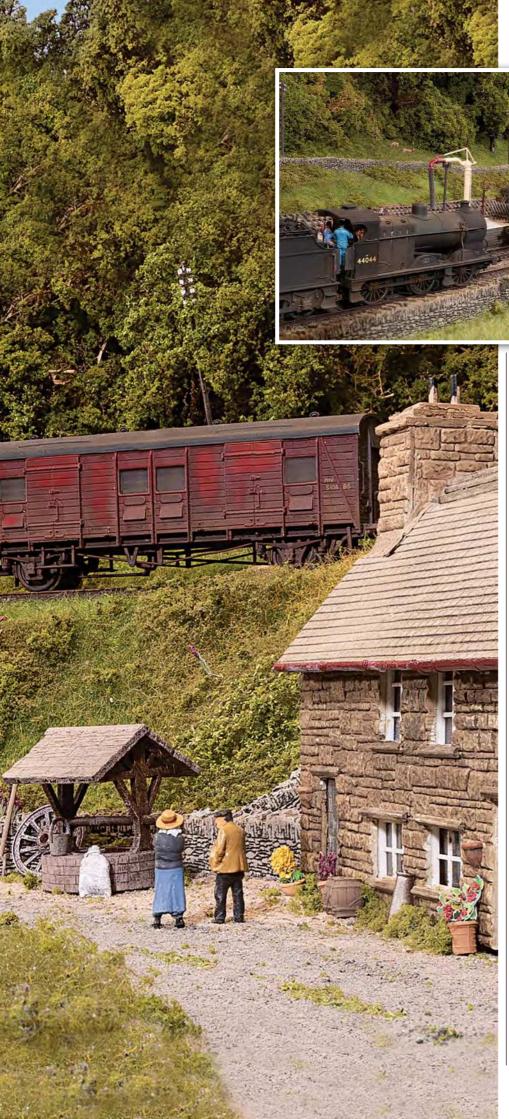
I thought long and hard about naming the layout and eventually settled

the layout and eventually settled on Misselthwaite – the name of the Yorkshire manor house from the novel The Secret Garden which I loved reading growing up. I thought it would not be >>

too much of a stretch to imagine a quaint village near this house served by a former Midland Railway branch line.

My parents kindly allowed me to keep my original layout in place for use when I visit them, so I decided to stick with the same late 1950s West Yorkshire setting and theme so I could film YouTube videos of the same trains running on both layouts and then edit them to appear as if it was one continuous railway. I needed to use similar materials and techniques as before to create a sense of continuity between the two.

Having a much smaller layout this time around was a blessing in many ways, not least for the wallet. It meant I could really go to town on small details like point rodding and scenery, as well as quality baseboard construction, buildings and track without it taking me an age to finish anything. I'd also learnt a lot since building my first layout, and was excited to try out some new methods and avoid any mistakes I'd made previously.

#### **SIMPLE PLAN**

Having only 2ft of baseboard depth meant I decided to keep the track plan very simple so I could maximise scenery in front of and behind the track. I've modelled a terminus station at the end of my fictional branch line, very loosely based on and inspired by Oxenhope on the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway. It has a run-round loop and a single goods siding as well as a couple of headshunts.

It might not be the most interesting setup from an operational perspective, but I wanted to keep the theme of a railway in a landscape rather than a flat baseboard covered in track. It's more than enough to keep me entertained. I also wanted to ensure I framed the view

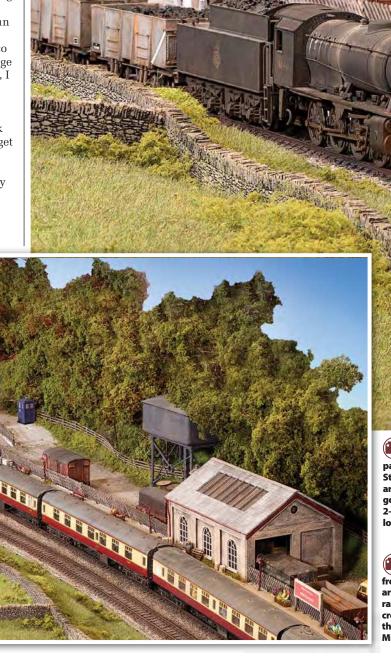

of the layout by building the scenery to fall away in front of the track and rise behind. This makes filming and photographing easier, as you can in effect get below the locomotive as if you were standing at the bottom of an embankment looking up, which gives a very realistic view.

I stuck with a simple analogue Gaugemaster Combi controller with manual points and signals and kept all wiring simple. I've considered upgrading to Digital Command Control but as the layout is single track and I only ever run a single train at any one time, I've not really felt a pressing need. Track is Peco code 100 and is ballasted using 'N' gauge Geoscenics products which, like many, I feel works well in 4mm scale.

The track was weathered with my trusty airbrush using Tamiya acrylics, as well as some of the Geoscenics track weathering kits. I was keen to try and get the road and goods yard surfaces a bit better this time around. I used another Geoscenics product for this - effectively a series of fine powders which create a realistic appearance, especially of the ash ballast commonly used in goods yards and for sidings.

#### **SCENERY AND STOCK**

In terms of buildings, I tried laser-cut kits for the station building and goods shed which turned out well. I went for scratchbuilt terraced cottages elsewhere using Wills stone and slate roof sheets, with the clear packaging for these as the window panes. For station platforms, I used 15mm foamboard edged with Wills stone sheets and topped with filler. I smoothed this down, sanded once dry and painted it grey. I applied white edging using tape to get a clean line. This method allowed me to build a long curved platform capable of holding a

locomotive and eight coaches.

I upgraded from the cat litter dry stone walls used on my previous layout to foam versions produced by Osborn's Models, which whilst being more expensive, look a lot more convincing. They also have the benefit of not disintegrating when I accidentally lean on them. I have used Woodland Scenics products for most of the scenery and static grass.

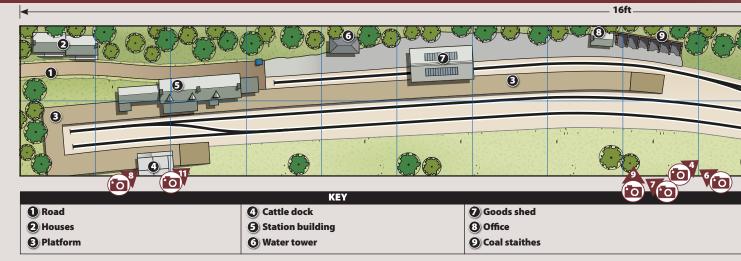
For trees, I used the same method as on the previous layout – twisted wire covered in DAS modelling clay and spray painted brown, with seafoam superglued to the branches and covered in Woodland Scenics light green coarse turf using hairspray.

The backscene is hand painted, but with the back of the layout being lined with tall trees, its only partially visible. I had a go at modelling a canal using PVA glue for the water which worked quite well. I've tried to add a few small cameo scenes so there is something interesting to view in the foreground when I'm filming trains going past such as campers, hikers and a canal boat loaded with coal.

Filming trains on both layouts means

careful attention being paid to matching the same formations of coaches and wagons to create a sense of continuity in the videos I film and upload to YouTube. To complete a journey on both layouts, I have to transport any stock between the two which involves a 157-mile car journey. Any videos you see of a locomotive travelling on both layouts means it's completed a 300-mile round trip!

Since my previous larger layout, I've spent a fair amount of time improving and detailing my locomotives and rolling stock which I've really enjoyed. I've switched over to Kadee couplings, which whilst no more authentic for British layouts than tension locks, do in my opinion look better and are very reliable. I've also replaced moulded details like smokebox door darts on older locomotives, as well as adding lamp irons and cab details. I've close coupled everything, built some coaches and wagons from kits and renumbered and renamed some locomotives. I've added Modelu lamps to most locomotives which slot straight over the lamp irons and so can be changed depending on what headcode a train needs.

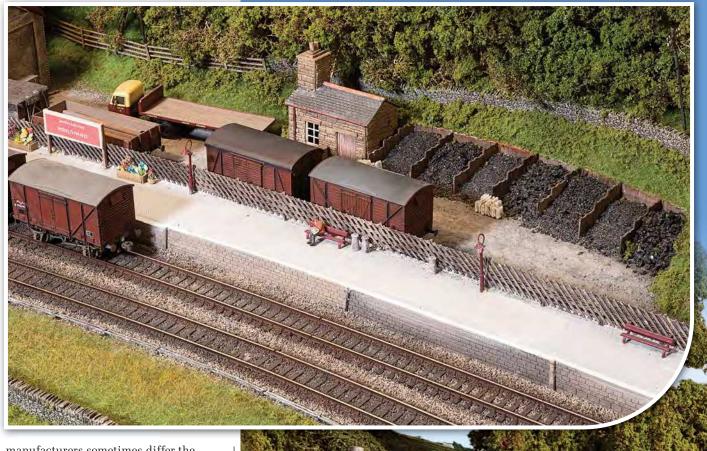
Another big improvement was the addition of West Hill Wagon Works magnetic couplings to my coaches. I always considered it strange that

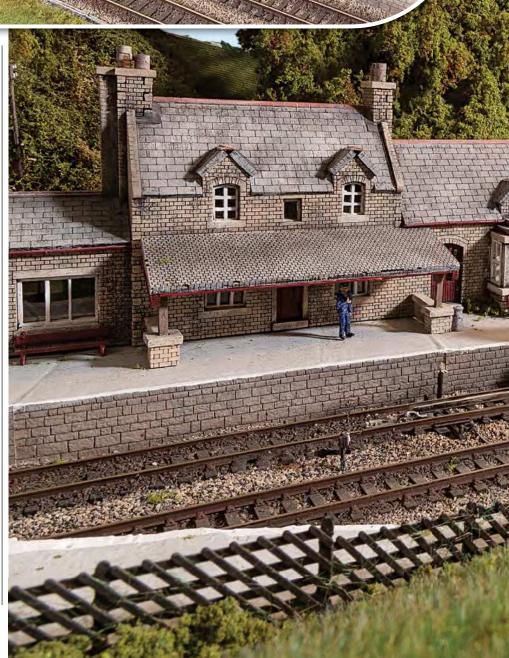
manufacturers sometimes differ the height of the NEM sockets between coaches, which can make coupling a challenge – these magnetic couplings have resolved this issue for me. I've also continued to develop my skills at weathering and undertook my first few commissions which were nervewracking but very rewarding.

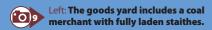
I continue to run anything I fancy on the layout but do try to keep things prototypical in a session. Most locomotives are BR Standards or London Midland & Scottish Railway and London and North Eastern Railway classes with a couple of Great Western Railway and Southern Railway types included. The locomotive roster includes a Stanier 'Black Five' 4-6-0 and '8F' 2-8-0, Hughes-Fowler 'Crab' 2-6-0, Ivatt '2MT' 2-6-2T and Fowler '4F' 0-6-0, a Thompson 'B1' 4-6-0 plus BR '4MT' 4-6-0 and 2-6-4Ts, a 'Britannia' 4-6-2, a '9F' 2-10-0 and an ex-War Department 'Austerity' 2-8-0.

In terms of development, I still have a few period advertisements to add to the station fencing and small details to add but nothing significant. I'm also looking forward to acquiring some of the long-awaited new releases on the layout such as Accurascale's Class 37 diesel and Hornby's new Standard '2MT' 2-6-0 and 'Black Five' 4-6-0.

All in all, I'm really pleased with my new, smaller layout – although I already can't help but start thinking of what's coming next. **HM**

#### STEP BY STEP WEATHERING A TRANSPENNINE EXPRESS NOVA 3 SET



The underframes of disc-braked locomotives aren't coated in the familiar rusty tones of corroding metallic particles the way engines with conventional iron brake blocks are. A more appropriate colour for a Class 68 would be a warm black, something like NATO Brown from Tamiya (Cat No. XF-69) or LifeColor's ever useful Burned Black (UA736). I airbrushed a thin, uneven mist at about 20psi.



A study of Andy Glover's detail photographs also reveals a subtle build-up of road dirt on the underframes. I started the process off with a few dots of heavily diluted acrylics, an 80:20 mix of Red Brown (XP-64) and Flat Black (XF-1).



Work fast now because acrylics dry incredibly quickly – less experienced weatherers might prefer to use enamels. With a stiff and very wet brush dipped in airbrush cleaner, dab off as much of the brown mix as you can, coaxing it into the nooks and crannies of the underframe and creating random weathering patterns.



Now to the roofs, and the chance to spray the roof fan areas liberally with Flat Black. You can blacken the exhausts at the same time but don't go too madas ever, a light touch brings the best results. Incidentally, 68026 and upwards have black airconditioning units.



I've lightly misted the roof areas with three separate applications of black – NATO Black (XF-69), Flat Black (12) from Mr Hobby and the very interesting Steel Red (36) from the same stable, which has a subtle metallic sheen.





I always look closely at the silencers on big modern diesels. They generally start off silver (although EMD's Class 66s never did) but soon blacken and corrode. A flick of rust-coloured weathering powder is easier than trying to paint or airbrush this kind of thing.



Rainwater washes soot and dirt from the roof down the bodysides. You can represent this with paint, but I prefer the subtlety of weathering powder – MIG in this instance, now sold under the Abteilung 502 brand. First apply a few irregular dabs of black using a cotton bud.

Now take a broad, flat brush moistened with white spirit and create vertical streaks, closely following our reference photographs. Remember, though, that the more pigment you put on, the more you'll have to take off.



Keep brushing away with the white spirit until you have the effect you want and then leave the model to dry thoroughly for 24 hours. If it goes wrong, wash it all off and start again. I become very attached to my brushes – I've had some of them for years.



When it came to the TPE Nova 3 Mk 5a set, I wanted to create the impression of coaches that had only recently entered service, with minimal impact from the weather, environment and operating conditions. 'Wake up and smell fresh paint' was my guiding principle. For my colour palette, I used LifeColor's superb Black Rubber set and the delicacy of an Iwata HP-SB side-feed airbrush.



I started with Dirty Black (UA731) and then moved on to Worn Black (UA734). You need only the tiniest amounts to take the edge off the factory-fresh shine. I masked the bodysides – which were to remain pristine – with the back of an old postcard.



I was surprised how clean the roofs of the TPE sets seem to be - there's even a bit of sheen on them. I gave each roof nothing more than the quickest of wafts with the two black shades I'd already used, with the addition of a hint of **Deep Cockpit** (UA735).



On some of Andy's photographs I noticed clear signs of sooting on the coach ends nearest the locomotive – just as you'd find on an articulated lorry trailer next to the exhaust on the tractor unit, only not so intense. This is NATO Black again – softer and less stark than a conventional matt black.



Clean but showing obvious signs of use, Stadler-built 68031 Felix (named after the station cat at Huddersfield) displays the powerful lines of these Spanish-built machines, sub-leased to First Group for Trans-Pennine duties but occasionally seen on other workings.

## Transpennine Express Class 68 and Mk 5s





The bold TransPennine Express colour scheme sits well on the Class 68s. While at first glance the locomotive appears clean, closer inspection reveals road dirt, exhaust streaking and even deposits from the windscreen wiper. Andy Glover.



Rainwater causes soot and dirt deposits to streak down the bodyside. Interestingly, the underframe tanks appear reasonably clean on 68021. It also looks as though the warning labels have received a wipe over at some point. Andy Glover.



Look at the different colours on 68021's exhaust silencer with varying shades of black and corrosion. Once in service this area soon changes appearance. Andy Glover.

Right: Another useful view showing how the Mk 5 carriages couple to the locomotives. The carriage at this end of the five-car Nova 3 set does not feature a corridor connection and is showing signs of deposits from the locomotive. Andy Glover.

Left: For modellers this overhead view is great as it provides guidance on where to place buffer beam pipework, as well as demonstrating the angular roof sections and how they weather in service. Note those air horn covers too.

## Building a low relief BUSDEPOT

Low relief buildings are an excellent means of suggesting depth to a model railway where space is at a premium. **DAN EVASON** creates a unique bus depot scene in 'OO' gauge.



LOW RELIEF BUILDING can really enhance a model railway scene, particularly where space is at a premium. In this guide we show how to make your own low relief bus depot – a classic town and city structure which can be built to any size.

The design for this building offers two bays together with a small office to one side. However, you could easily expand the building to have three or four openings or add additional sections in the same style but without doors for the bus company to service and maintain its fleet.

The challenge with any scratchbuilt structure like this is going from idea

to reality. Where do you start? Size is the most important question and to set the wheels in motion, we used the Oxford Diecast Weymann Fanfare bus as a guide to how high the door openings should be which then determined the overall size. Remember if you have double deck buses you will need a higher opening for the doors. The style was modelled from photographs on the internet using Flemish bond brick plastic sheets laid over a card structure.

The completed building was painted with acrylics and finished with guttering components from Modelu and South Wales lettering from a Squires etched sheet. The final steps were to create an MDF

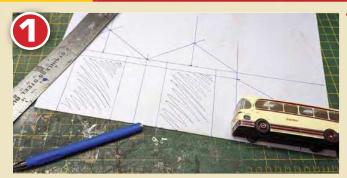

### STEP BY STEP

### **BUILDING A LOW RELIEF BUS DEPOT**



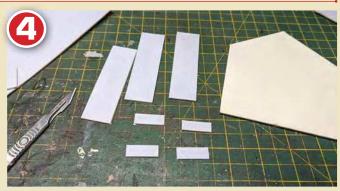
When scratchbuilding, there are no instructions - just you and an idea. To start the process, I used an Oxford Diecast Weymann Fanfare as a scale reference to design the depot frontage. Artists mount card has been used to create the basic structure, the key being to use a fresh blade when you start cutting the card.



With the basic shape now drawn, I added a side office. I came across a set of laser cut doors and windows in my spares box which fitted the bill. These were marked onto the building shell, remembering to make the window openings smaller than the window frames.



To cut out the components, I used a fresh scalpel and a steel straight edge. It is always best to run the knife along the cut line multiple times than to try and cut through in one go. You will also find that your cuts are more accurate with less pressure applied.



With the rear now cut out, it was time to make the side walls, the depth of which can be altered to suit your needs. I want to create a depth of about 25mm with the walls and to create additional strength, extra sections were cut out to brace the walls.



To join the parts together, I selected Deluxe Materials Roket Card glue. This instantly grabs the card components together for a strong bond. The support tabs were also added together with roof supports to make the structure strong.



While the rear of the depot sets, we can work on the front panel. I was keen to add the feeling of depth to the front walls. For this I cut some thin 5mm strips of card. These were glued into place, making sure they were square. I also added upper strips to the doors on the inside.



With glue now dry in the rear section, I sprayed the inside Matt Black to give it a sense of depth by plunging the interior into darkness.



Next, the basic shell needs bricks. Finescale Flemish bond brick embossed plastic sheet from Squires has been used for this purpose. As the sheets were larger than the depot, I simply laid the building face down, bonding the brick sheets to the card shell with Roket Card glue. Once dry, I loosely trimmed off the excess which will be cleaned up later.

Next, I moved across to the window openings. I slowly scored the knife from behind until I broke through the plasticard, then, where required, I used a small file to tidy up the corners.



As the building is mainly viewed from the front, I was keen to hide any visible joints. This is the reason I have not trimmed the front to fit properly as it means I can hide the side joints of the brick plasticard. Once dry, the sides and openings can be trimmed so the brickwork is flush.



The two halves of the building can now be joined together using Roket Card glue. It may be necessary to use weights to hold the building down flat and level while the adhesive cures.



Once the structure is complete, you can clad the sides of the building. With all the main brickwork in place, it is time to trim the front. Very carefully start trimming away until you are left with flush clean edges.



With the main brickwork now complete, I wanted to add some architectural details. These were created using cut strips of brick embossed sheet overlaid on to the main brickwork. Using reference images as a guide, the strips were glued in place.



Across the door openings, iron support beams were added from plastic strip. These were cut to length and fixed in place with superglue.

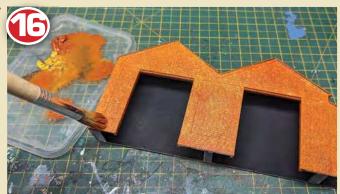

### **BUILDING A LOW RELIEF BUS DEPOT**



For the roof, Wills corrugated sheeting was used, cut to size and fixed in place with Roket Card glue. Plastic strip was also added to model gutters and for the centre of the two joining roof pitches.



Painting follows a tried and tested method. Dabs of Daler Rowney Burnt Sienna, Burnt Umber and Yellow Ochre are placed on a plastic lid and then stippled onto the building in random patches until it is covered.



To seal the acrylic base colours, Matt Lacquer has been used. Only when this has fully dried can you move on to the next step.



With the lacquer now dry, focus turns to the bricks again. To create the mortar, I use Daler Rowney Buff Titanium and a spot of Burnt Umber applied with a wet brush. This is applied over all the brickwork, which doesn't look pretty to start with.



With the mortar paint still wet, it's time to work fast to remove it before it dries. I've tried a selection of methods for removing the excess paint and the best tool you can use is your thumb and a tissue to clean it with as you wipe away.



Using Tamiya X64 Dark Iron and a steady hand, I painted the iron girder. This also helps to break up visually the large area of brickwork.



For the doors I wanted to model the classic concertina style. After looking through arts and crafts materials, I came across a brown foam which was ideal for the job. Panels were cut to size with a craft knife.



The doors were given a cream colouring, similar to the Weymann Fanfare South Wales Transport colour scheme, and by applying the paint thinly, the brown of the foam showed through as a rust effect. These were glued to make the doors appear as if they were not fully shut, adding more detail to the building.

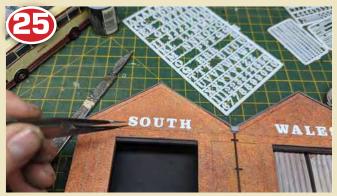




For the office, Vallejo Burnt Red and Cream colours were used for the doors and window frames prior to them being fixed in position with Roket Card glue. Clear glazing was cut from plastic sheet.



The central guttering was built around a Modelu 3D-printed rectangular hopper (Cat No. 2905) which was glued in place and painted later in the build. A downpipe was added from plastic strip.



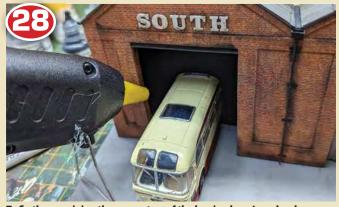
Another rummage through my spares box came up with a set of individual letters from Squires which were cut from their sprue and then spaced out across the doorways to spell South Wales.



As I wanted the bus to appear half inside, I used a razor saw to cut off the rear quarter of the model. I used a jig to ensure the cut was square all the way through the model.



Weathering started with War World Scenics Black Soot powder. This was applied gradually to build up the dirt around the building.



To fix the remaining three-quarters of the bus in place, I used a glue gun: superglue would have caused fogging of the clear glazing on the model.

Having decided our inspiration would be Stratford TMD, PJM Models created

a laser-cut kit to include the office building at one end and the stores to one side and, to make the building more flexible, we added an additional four-road through depot kit.

In combination, the kits can be used in multiple to build larger depots as we have for Natford TMD. Optional parts are included in the kits to allow two to be joined together while the kits also

include a full complement of lasercut MDF and plywood parts as well as laser-cut glazing.

Assembly is straightforward as all

parts are designed to fit together with slots and tabs. To bond the parts together, we used Deluxe Materials Roket Rapid superglue for the main structure and the same supplier's Glue 'n' Glaze for the windows as superglue would cause fogging of the glazing.

One of the biggest challenges with a building like this is painting, particularly with so many windows. We built the main structure of each building first, then separated all the window frames from the laser-cut fret to paint the building and window frames separately. This meant that the final process was installation of the glazing and painted window frames into the painted structure.

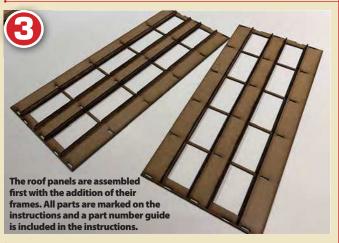
### STEP BY STEP BUILDING KEY PUBLISHING'S LASER-CUT DEPOT KITS

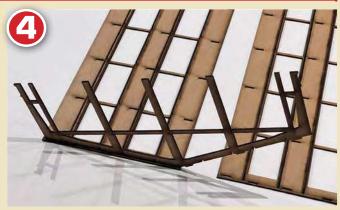




The kits are designed to allow the building to be constructed as standalone pieces or to be joined together. When joining kits together, the scored section at the end of the roof needs to be removed for a flush joint.

All of the components for the depot kits, including glazing, are laser cut. They are designed to be a tight fit, but if parts aren't fitting into their slots, check the clearances rather than forcing them in. Also note that once painted, parts like window frames will be a tight fit into their openings.





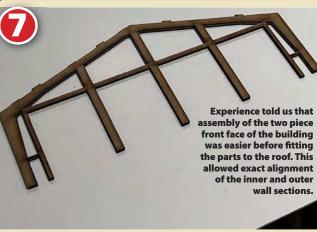
Assembly of the roof is handled one half at a time. We also found it easier to pre-assemble the two piece front panel of the building, see step 7.





After the roof frames, the main structure of depot can be assembled. We are using Deluxe Materials Roket Rapid superglue through the main construction.







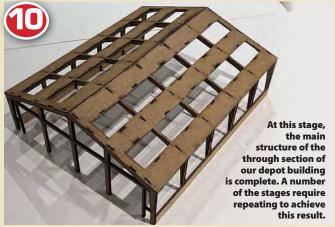
With the main structure complete, the inner and outer walls were added followed by the window frames. Again, Roket Rapid superglue was used to fix all of these parts together.

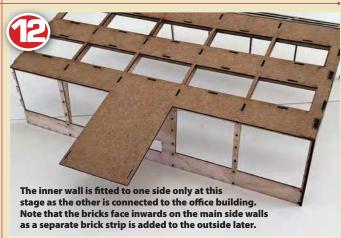


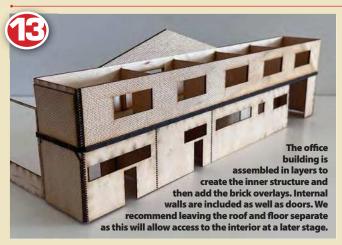


A set of plywood window supports fit into the roof from below to support the final window frames. Note there are three styles – one for each end and a third for the centre roof windows in each row.











The inner wall, which is connected to the end of the office building, is added next to the main building now the office structure is complete.



The outer brick layers have now been added to the main building as well as the window frames, completing the structural elements of the build.

### STEP BY STEP BUILDING KEY PUBLISHING'S LASER-CUT DEPOT KITS





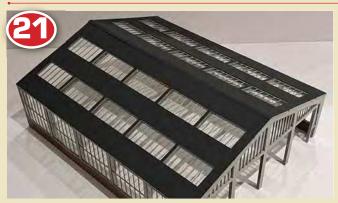
The concrete colour applied to the framework is Ford Dove Grey from the Halfords spray paint range. The window frames were painted the same colour and left to dry before moving to the next stage.



The windows and frames are a repetitive but rewarding task. Laser cut glazing is included in the kit and slots into each opening prior to the addition of the laser cut window frames. We pre-painted all the window frames with Halfords grey primer and Ford Dove Grey before assembly.



Our adhesive of choice for the glazing and window frames is Deluxe Materials Glue 'n' Glaze which dries clear after application.



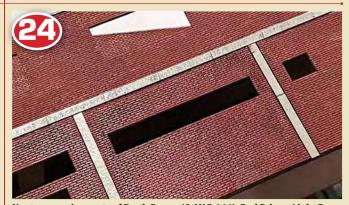
Black card cover layers are included in each kit to add to the roof after the glazing and window frames have been installed. We secured these in place with Glue 'n' Glaze, but you could use spray mount as an alternative.



Brickwork uses a combination of MIG Ammo Urban Diorama colours using dry brushing techniques.



The brick painting starts with Dart Dust (A.MIG-041) from the Urban Dioramas paint set. A small amount at a time is placed on a plastic tray and then brushed across the brick faces.



Next, successive coats of Earth Brown (A.MIG-064), Red Primer Light Base (A.MIG-921) and finally small amounts of Ochre Brown (A.MIG-102) are added to give texture to the brick faces.

Finally, Stone Grey (A.MIG-075) is lightly washed across the bricks and allowed to run into the mortar courses to soften the finish. The finishing touch was application of Lifecolor Warm Wood to the doors.



The two buildings are now assembled and, having checked they match correctly on the workbench, are ready for installation.



To create the hardstanding around the Peco inspection pits, we used 2mm MDF cut to shape. The sizes were measured, transferred to the MDF sheets and then cut with a craft knife. When cutting MDF with a craft knife, make several light passes for a neat cut and then sand the edges.



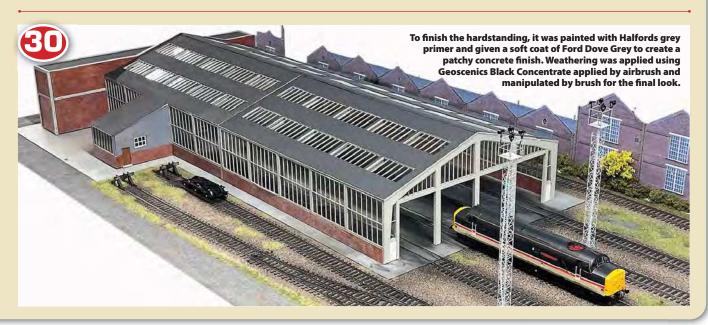
The hardstanding was built up in sections around the track base, ensuring each successive piece fitted together square with the previous piece.

## Conerdale

A fascinating never-built railway is the subject of Keighley Model Railway Club's pre-grouping 'O' gauge layout. **JOHN BUCK** explains how history was altered to bring this route to life.

OVERDALE is a classic 'might have been' layout. It started life as part of a grand plan by the Yorkshire Dales Railway (YDR) that would give access to the industrial North East and the North West from Skipton. The proposal included a line that would extend from Grassington further up Wharfedale and into Coverdale via a 6,000yd tunnel under Great Whernside to join up with the North Eastern Railway (NER) at Leyburn.

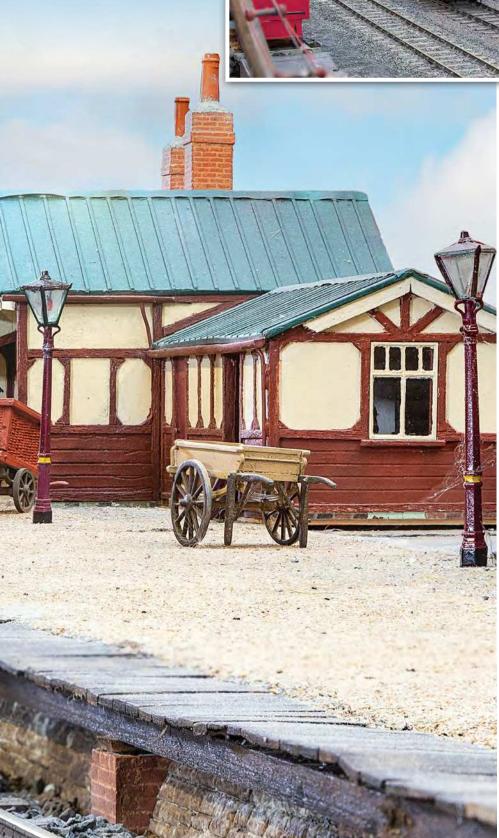
The plans were overambitious and the North Eastern Railway objected to any invasion of its territory, so that part of the plan failed. The YDR was, however, able to construct a line from Skipton to Grassington with Midland Railway support. Although the Midland Railway provided locomotives, rolling stock, signalling and track maintenance, the YDR survived until 1923 when it was absorbed by the London Midland & Scottish Railway (LMS).

The Coverdale part of the YDR proposal was never realised. Even if agreement could be reached with the NER, the enormous expense of building a deep tunnel to get between the two dales at Kettlewell could never be justified by the anticipated traffic.

### **THE LAYOUT**

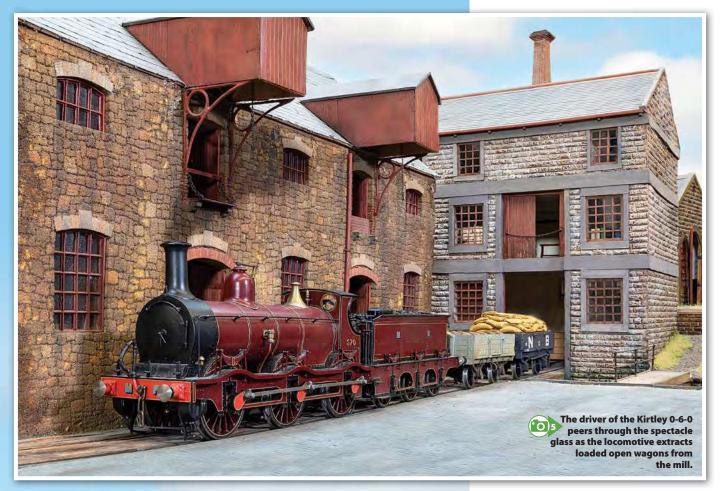
Such constraints do not apply to railway modellers. In this alternate history, we built the tunnel and placated the NER. Now we have a railway through Coverdale built by the YDR/MR with the NER having joint running powers. If the full ambitions of the YDR had been realised then there would also be the prospect of London & North Western Railway trains.

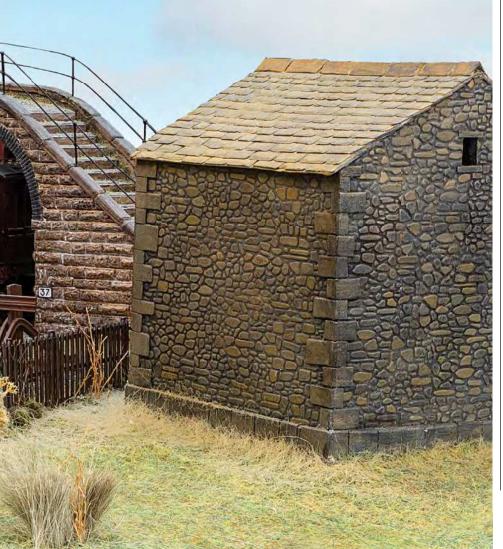
Building started 12 years ago with, over the years, many members making a contribution. The boards are constructed from 9mm ply. This makes them strong and resilient but also heavy. There are five 5ft 6in long scenic boards and two 6ft long storage yards. The layout has been exhibited but its size and weight make it cumbersome and expensive to transport.











The track plan evolved in two stages. The first station yard had a pair of interleaved points with a crossing similar to the one at Damems on the Keighley & Worth Valley Railway. While prototypical, this configuration, when compressed to fit on the layout, proved difficult to operate effectively.

About five years ago the interleaved points and crossing were replaced by a loop with a double slip when the layout was radically reconstructed. This revision also removed a number of buildings to give the layout a more open feel. At this time we also created a short extension through a tunnel onto the storage yard to serve a quarry. A quarry gives a reason to keep the line open into the 21st century. The opportunity was also taken to rewire and fit Cobalt point motors. Operation is by two controllers which allows both storage yards and the quarry siding to be operated.

All the track is hand laid with the exception of two double slips which are from Peco. The hand laid track is on wooden sleepers with C&L chairs. The two Peco double slips have had their original tie bars removed in favour of something more realistic. The track is all constructed to correct Midland Railway standards, including rail section length, sleeper spacing and inter-track spacing.

To date there has been little demand for Digital Command Control (DCC), but this may change and the option to make it available is being considered. The changes greatly improved operating potential, although the storage yard length puts constraints on train length.



### MORE RECONSTRUCTION

A planned move within the club will give us the opportunity for a second less radical reconstruction. We will be able to remove the two storage yards and replace them with a continuous circuit. It is not intended to change the overall feel of the layout but some changes will be needed to accommodate the curves needed to fit it into its new space. The opportunity will also be taken to improve some of the existing structures. The big advantage of the new configuration is that it will be possible to run realistic length trains. We also hope to make the layout multi period. Most if not all of the structures would have had very long lives. By making the figures and possibly a few other items removable we will be able to switch period and enable a greater range of stock to run.

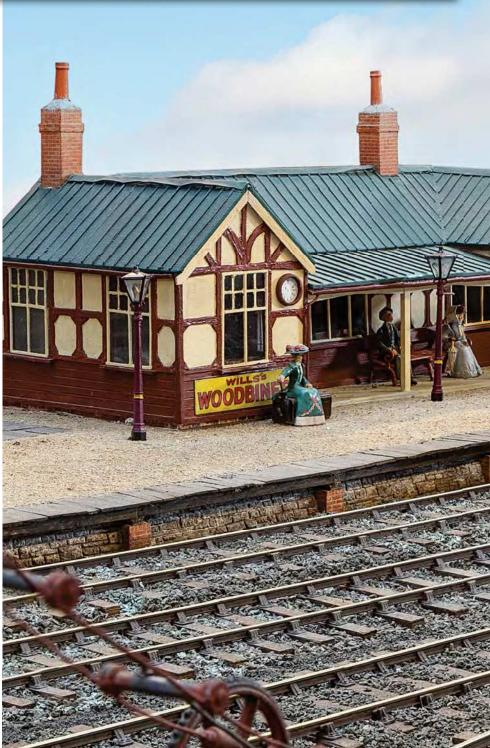
As the layout is intended to represent an area of low population in the Yorkshire Dales, we have kept buildings to a minimum although the mill buildings are relatively big.

### **STRUCTURES**

The railway buildings are typical Midland Railway, with a signalbox and small goods shed. The station is typical of the small wooden structures favoured by many railway companies at the turn of the last century and is based on the station building at Grassington, which would have been a few miles further down the line. The platform is interesting in that it has brick pillars with a sloped infill of stone. This matches the platform at Grassington and other stations on that line.

The mill building on the right is, with the goods shed, all that remains of the original buildings on the layout. The second mill and the boiler house are part of the first reconstruction. The gap between the two buildings provides an interesting viewpoint. They also create height in the middle of the layout giving a sense of distance beyond.

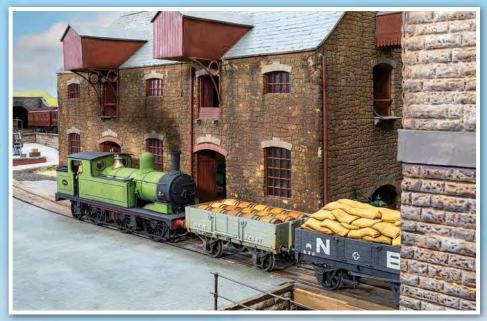
The unusual footbridge just beyond the

platform is a model of Ings Bridge on the Grassington branch of The Yorkshire Dales Railway. It carries an ancient footpath from Linton to Threshfield and still exists, long after the railway was shut.

There are plans to signal the layout. It is intended to have them demountable and operating. Although we could make them interchangeable with modern colour lights, it is also probable that such a marginal line would have retained semaphore signals.

Originally stock was pre-grouping, mostly NER and MR. Most of the stock is kit or scratchbuilt and the NER locos are radio controlled. Radio control offers many advantages over DC and DCC and I expect that its use will increase in the future. The advent of good quality ready-to-run models in 'O' gauge has led to members turning up with more modern stock, some of the locomotives not even having chimneys.

### **FULL POTENTIAL**

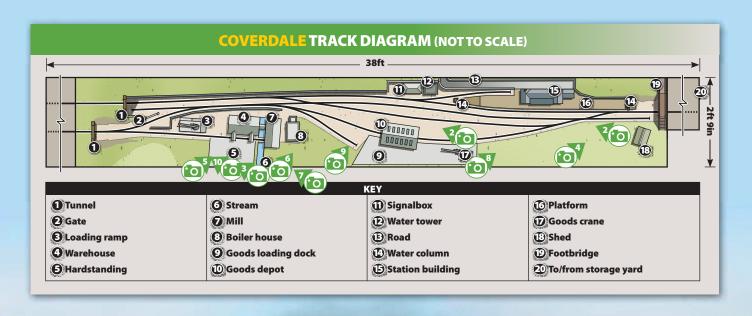
Overall, I think we have created a layout that reflects the timeless atmosphere of a small station in the Yorkshire Dales.

The layout was conceived as a project to draw new members into the Keighley club and this is still the case. We would like more people to get involved in converting Coverdale into a continuous run layout that will unleash its full potential by allowing full length trains to run. If you are interested, please come along to Keighley Model Railway Club. This upgrade will take place in conjunction with the longer term planning of a completely new layout that will eventually replace Coverdale.

The group has also committed to building a 12ft module that will be part of the Gauge 'O' Guild's modular layout project. If you just want to see the layout, it is based at Keighley Model Railway Club and can be viewed on one of our open days. See the KMRC website for details.

Railway and British Railways era locomotives. For review we had the opportunity to inspect two versions finished as 373 in elegant Great Central Railway lined green (Cat No. S4101-01) and 69804 in BR lined black with early crests

(S4101-07).

Both models are superbly assembled and have a very solid feel through the use of die-casting for the main body elements

Sonic Models' first ever ready-to-run 'OO' gauge model is the Robinson 'A5' -6-2T. Our review samples were finished as 69804 in BR black with early crests and 373 in Great Central Railway lined green.

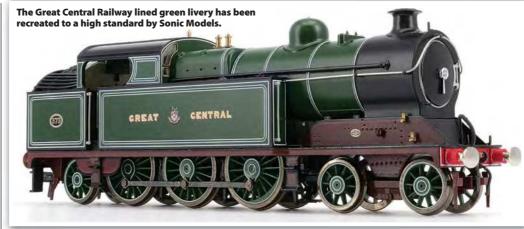

The overall dimensions are close to the prototype with the locomotives measuring 171mm over buffers, ever so slightly under the 172mm they should be to model the 43ft length exactly. The height is correct while the proportions of the 'A5' are well captured by Sonic Models.

While there are a lot of good points to appreciate about the 'A5', there are also a couple of elements which aren't quite so good. The lip on the top of the chimney isn't as pronounced as images of the real locomotives show while the dummy screw link coupling is simplified too much in our view. In addition, we noticed a little distortion in the coal rails on our GCR sample while the red paint on the buffer beams didn't have 100% coverage.

However, those points aside, there is much to appreciate. For starters, there are sprung buffers of two different types at each end of the locomotive together with NEM coupling pockets which sit neatly in line with the buffer beams. The smokebox door looks spot on and features period correct darts for different locomotives together with separately fitted handrails and alternative upper lamp iron positions to suit GCR/LNER and BR period locomotives.

The good work continues along the boiler where different domes are available in the tooling suite and there is also separately fitted

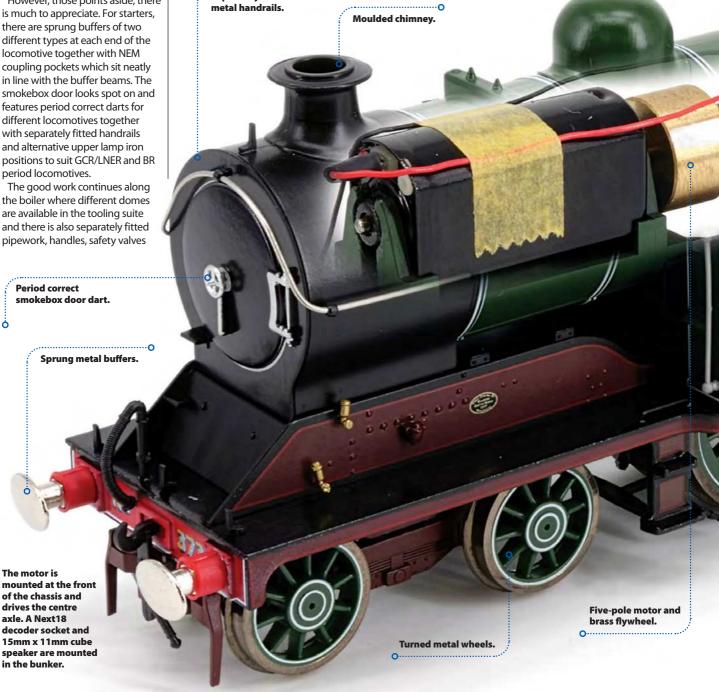


and more. The bulky side tanks are also reproduced well, together with correct shaping of the footplate around the sides tanks. Completing the picture is a detailed

underframe which features factory fitted brake shoes in line with the wheels, sandboxes and optional brake rigging in the accessory pack to further enhance these 4-6-2Ts.

Livery application is also impressively well done overall and includes finely applied lining on both the GCR and BR locomotives as well as neatly printed numbers,

crests and builder's plates. Even the cab interior is fully painted, despite it being difficult to see on the BR version with side window cab. Happily the cab roof can be removed for full access to fit a crew – a nice touch.

### **PERFORMANCE**

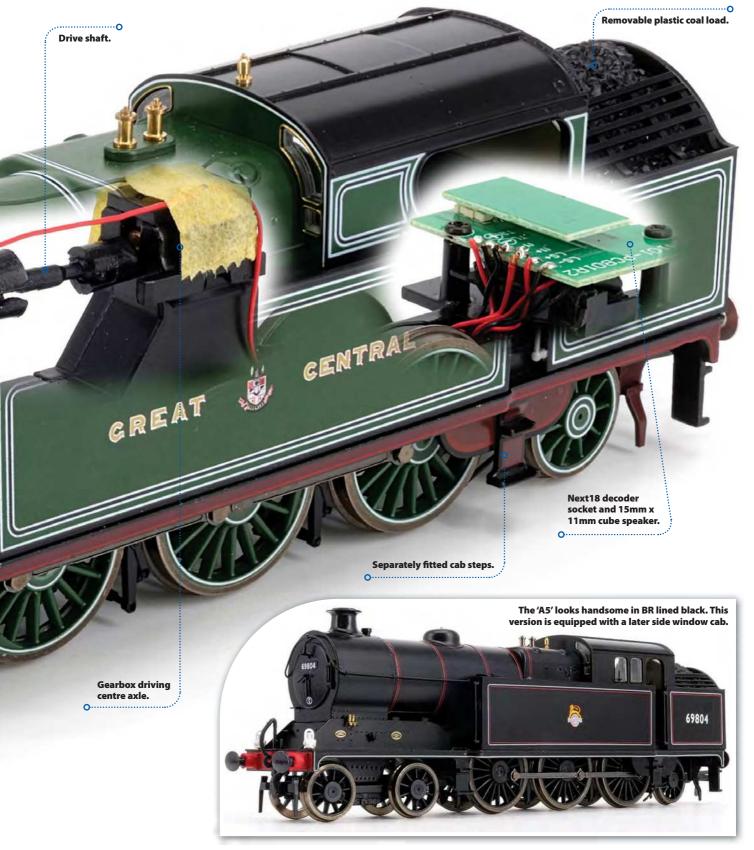
On the track we were impressed with the performance of these 4-6-2Ts. Interestingly, most of their weight comes from the body rather than the chassis – the latter appearing quite lean by comparison to other locomotives. However, don't let that concern you as once we had followed the running in procedure outlined in the instruction sheet, these two locomotives ran beautifully during our testing and proved capable of hauling a 10-coach train with ease. Inside, the models are equipped with a Next18 decoder socket mounted in the bunker together

with a 15mm x 11mm cube speaker beneath the decoder socket. Access is straightforward and requires the removal of three screws from the underside of the model. Care is needed when reassembling the 'A5s' to ensure the sand pipes aren't trapped by the wheels.

### **OVERALL**

Sonic Models' debut 'OO' gauge locomotive is an excellent choice, and importantly a class which

has never been covered before. The rugged looks of the real locomotives transpose well into 'OO' gauge and overall we feel that Sonic Models has done a good job on its first product for the scale, despite a couple of small points. If this is a sign of the future, we can see Sonic Models creating attractive 'missing links' to a high standard. A great start in 'OO' gauge which we would be happy to add to our own collection. (MW)

## CENTRAL 5

Built originally for heavy suburban traffic out of London Marylebone station, the 'A5' 4-6-2Ts spread their wings to all corners of the London and North Eastern Railway's system. **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** looks into the history of this long extinct class.



# **REALITY CHECK**

T THE DAWN OF THE
20th century, commuting
into and out of major cities
had become an established
feature of life. Increased
income meant that many
in the middle classes had deserted poor
conditions in the city centre and taken up
residence in newly-developed suburbs.

What became known as commuter traffic was soon a major source of income for the railways, with one of those benefitting greatly from this being the Great Central Railway (GCR). It was a latecomer to the capital but won a great deal of this business from its Marylebone terminus, helped by the expansion of London Transport services into what became famously known as 'Metroland'.

This nascent traffic was in the hands of 4-4-2Ts but as trains got longer and timings were accelerated they struggled. The issue was considered by the GCR's Chief Mechanical Engineer, John Robinson, who concluded that a large-boilered tank locomotive with superheating and six coupled wheels was required. Any replacement would also need to have the ability to run equally as fast

in both directions (hence opting for a tank locomotive) and would need good acceleration.

The resulting design, which was initially known as the GCR Class '9N' but which later became the 'A5', was one of the earliest GCR types to be superheated and initially two different types each with 18 elements were fitted. The first ten engines had Schmidt equipment while the rest of the 21-strong batch had a design by Robinson himself. All were later altered to the Robinson pattern.

Following normal GCR practice, the cabs did not have side windows and all locomotives were fitted with water pick-up equipment, although this was later removed. Construction was undertaken by the company at its Gorton works in Manchester, with locomotives being constructed between 1911 and 1917.

Although intended to be identical there were a number of variations in this batch. Locomotives constructed from 1912 onwards had 24-element superheaters with the vacuum exhauster pipe being placed outside of the boiler while from 1914 a 22-element design was adopted. Around 1917, boiler top-feed apparatus.

was introduced, which later became standard, while in 1920 Ross pop safety valves were fitted and boilers lost their safety valve base covers. Two different sizes were used on the class - short and tall. In 1919 some locomotives were fitted with 'Reliostop' apparatus, which was a form of mechanical automatic train control equipment bolted to the footplate below the cab on the left-hand side. Finally, three or five coal rails could be seen on the bunker.

# **POWERFUL AND RELIABLE**

The 'A5s' quickly proved successful, with the whole batch being allocated to Neasden and employed on the intended suburban services. There were, however, issues with the cab design and so, in September 1921, 450 was slightly rebuilt so that it had a cab with better side protection and cab windows. All other members of the initial batch were eventually modified in this way, although this took until 1926 for work to be completed.

In 1923 a further ten locomotives were ordered from Gorton, and these had side window cabs from new. One modification

was the fitting of ash ejection equipment which resulted in an extra pipe entering the smokebox on the right-hand side of the engine, but this was removed between 1934 and 1937. Like the earlier batch, these engines were built to the rather generous Great Central loading gauge which limited where they could be used, and as a result later in their lives some were fitted with lower, flatter domes and Gresleystyle chimneys to widen their sphere of operation.

Following the Grouping of 1923 the newly-formed London and North Eastern



Railway (LNER) commissioned another batch of 'A5s' for service in the North East of England. This time construction took place at contractor Hawthorn Leslie and Co. and this batch had a number of modifications, principally to bring them within the LNER's corporate loading gauge.

Fitted with side window cabs from new, these locomotives had flatter boiler domes and Gresley chimney, while the cab roof was reduced in height by 2in. The overall width of the locomotive was also reduced by 2in by cutting down the size of the side tanks and this reduced the water capacity by 180gallons and the coal capacity by three hundredweight. Redesigned cylinders were fitted, with the piston valves reduced in diameter from 10in to 8in inches and being given a longer travel.

Apart from the earliest of this batch, these locomotives had a slightly revised frame behind the smokebox intended to make oiling up easier following complaints from North Eastern footplatemen. A slight revision in dimensions saw an increase in length of 3in and left-hand drive was fitted instead of the right-hand previously employed. Westinghouse air brakes and Raven fog signalling equipment were fitted from new but were later removed.

# SPREADING THEIR WINGS

The arrival of the 1923 batch caused some of the earlier locomotives to be moved to Woodford and Annesley. The following year, six were moved to the West Riding of Yorkshire where they were shedded at Ardslev and found employment on the very hilly route between Bradford and Wakefield. This was not entirely successful as the engines were sent to Neasden and King's Cross four years later. At King's Cross, the 'A5s' replaced tender engines on the Hitchin and Baldock services, doing away with the requirement to run some services tender first. Some were later deployed on the route between Rickmansworth and Aylesbury.

There were more transfers to Yorkshire in the summer of 1937 when four went to Bradford for a few months while five were sent to the same area in 1941 when some 'N2' 0-6-2Ts were sent the opposite way. However, by 1942, the 30

remaining members of the class were all back at Neasden where they remained until replaced by new Thompsondesigned 'L1s' from 1948 onwards. A transfer to Lincolnshire then followed with Lincoln, Grantham and Boston each having an allocation. Two were later sent to Saltburn, then moving to Hull. Three spent some time then at Norwich where they performed admirably on the heavily-graded Cromer line.

In 1954, five were sent to Gorton for working expresses between Manchester Central and Guide Bridge but were also used on suburban trains out of what was then London Road station. This was shortlived as they were soon replaced by 'L1s', after which they were withdrawn and cut up. A similar fate awaited the remainder in Lincolnshire which were displaced by the arrival of new diesel railcars.

The history of the later, LNER built, engines was rather different. The 13 class members were allocated to Gateshead, Heaton and Blaydon and were employed on local passenger services on Tyneside. In 1928, six were sent to Saltburn for use on services to Darlington and on the coast route to Scarborough while three others were allocated to boat train workings between Tyne Quay and Newcastle. By 1939, all 13 were at Darlington where they remained for the next ten years, barring odd loans to other locations for a month

or two. In this period they could be found on Saltburn, Richmond and Tow Law workings as well as other heavily-loaded suburban services.

In 1949, four locomotives returned to Saltburn but their work was unaffected and this remained the case until 1951 when five departed for Norwich. An interesting but short-term transfer came in August that year when ten were loaned to Neasden for Liverpool Street-Southend services while a new turntable was being installed as part of the introduction to service of the British Railways 'Britannia' 4-6-2s. Once this was completed, the 'A5s' returned to their former sheds.

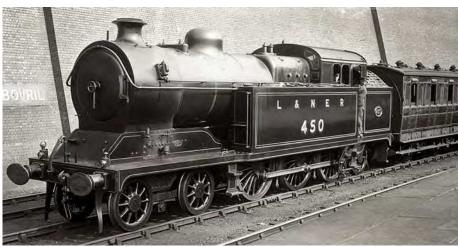
# **FINAL YEARS**

The final years of the class saw them working from various locations in the North East on heavy passenger work as well as on workman's trains to the Brough aircraft factory, near Hull. All 13 were taken out of service as a result of dieselisation and all had gone by the end of 1958.

One member of the class, 5447, was scrapped in December 1942 with badly cracked frames but this was the only locomotive to suffer this fate. Ten others were provided with new frames over the following years and this resulted in the rest of the class lasting until mass withdrawal, starting in 1957, and largely caused by the arrival of new diesels.

The 'A5s' were very successful locomotives which worked throughout their lives without any major rebuilding, modification or alteration. They were masters of heavy suburban trains and were known to be capable of quite high speed, 70mph being recorded in one case. Unfortunately none survived into preservation as their mass withdrawal came too early for any of them to be picked up by the growing heritage movement. However, their wide sphere of operation, coupled with the few differences between individual locomotives, is sure to make them a firm favourite amongst modellers of the steam era. HM

# RAPIDO REVIEW FROM RAPIDO Trains UK are these Trains UK are these

EW FROM RAPIDO
Trains UK are these
all-new'OO'gauge
BR 20ton ferry vans.
Built to BR Diagram 1/227 by
Pressed Steel and British Rail's
Ashford Works, the first examples
of these long wheelbase vans
entered traffic in the early 1960s
for use on cross-channel freight
services via train ferries. 450
examples were built across two
lots initially. Their appearance was
influenced by European designs
and they featured a large sliding
door on each side for loading and
unloading their cargo.

Whilst intended for freight use to and from Europe, these wooden-bodied vehicles were also used on domestic traffic too. They continued in frontline service into the 1980s, although new fleets of bogie vehicles which had started to appear on cross-channel traffic resulted in them being cascaded to other

Rapido Trains UK has produced

Our review samples included three vehicles from their later years in service finished as Barrier Vehicle RBX B787170 in patched and faded BR bauxite (Cat No. 910004), ZYX LDB786913 in BR departmental olive green (910011) and ZSX DB786980 in BR 'Dutch' yellow and grey (910009).

Straight from the box, the appearance of each is outstanding with an impressive combination of moulded and separately fitted detailing. This includes fine metal handrails, grab handles, lamp

irons, buffer rungs, foot steps, anchor points, brake handles, sprung buffers and a wealth of underframe detailing, plus the large bodyside doors slide open too!

Weighing in at 80g each, our samples also measured well against the prototypes at 168mm over headstocks and 183mm over buffers, along with a 105mm wheelbase.

Decoration was superb with our review samples displaying a high-quality paint finish together with crisply printed detail, including data panels, numbers and lettering. The faded appearance of our BR bauxite example was further enhanced with the appearance of more recent patch-painting, reflecting its changed duty.

Underneath, the model really excels with extensive separately applied detailing along the length of the underframe including

exquisite pipe runs, cylinders, brake equipment, fine – but delicate – truss and more. Turned metal three-hole disc wheels and small tension lock couplings in sprung NEM coupling cams are also fitted, while a small detailing pack containing coupling hooks and chains, air brake and vacuum brake pipes for customer fitment complete the package.

These latest releases from Rapido Trains UK are sure to prove popular as they were long-lived vehicles and now offer a step-change in terms of the level of finesse over what has gone before. They will add a touch of variety to freight train formations of the period and the detailing is quite simply sublime. (MC)

foodstuffs, cement and even gunpowder.

Rapido Trains UK's tooling suite for the all-new 'OO' gauge V6 'Iron Mink' vans reflect the alterations carried by the prototypes through the years and there are 21 different models available initially.

Of these, Rapido Trains has opted to produce eight models in fictitious colour schemes, inspired by liveries carried on other railway companies' vans, including one of our review samples finished in British Portland Cement Manufacturers light grey (Cat No. 908017).

Also received for review were the

altogether more authentic 59217 in GW grey with 16in lettering (908004) and 69627 in 1937 GW grey (908007). There are five other Great Western Railway grey vans with a choice of lettering styles, along with BR (W) grey and Salvage for Victory blue (x2), plus Southern Railway and GWR (x2) GPVs.

Weighing in at 30g each, these small yet well-proportioned models feature neatly moulded bodies with rounded edges and fine bodyside supports, roof strap detailing, metal buffers, handbrake levers and three different door options, two styles of end ventilators, as well as doublesided two, three or four brake

shoes. Our GWR samples featured three shoes, while the BPCM example featured four.

Closer inspection also reveals subtle detail differences between vehicles such as wooden doors to one of the earlier GWR liveried examples, while both GWR vans feature bodyside door catches the BPCM model doesn't. Indeed the detail even extends to different detailing to the metal doors with both our examples differing slightly with door catches on the GWR version only.

Application of the various colour schemes is up to the high standard we have come to expect from

the manufacturer with even paint finishes and crisp bodyside printed lettering - the white roofs also highlight the impressive strapping and rivet/bolt head detail.

Underneath the chassis features representation of the wooden deck planking and metal supports, together with brake equipment, levers and brake shoes, while the axlebox and spring detail is also very neatly moulded.

Eight-spoke turned metal wheels and small tension lock couplings in correct height NEM pockets round off these delightful new additions to the rapidly expanding Rapido Trains UK rolling stock roster. (MC)

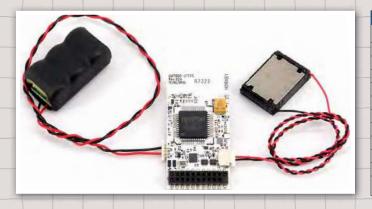

# Hornby launches FIRST HMDCC&REVIEW TRIPLEX SOUND

The world of digital is about to be turned on its head with the arrival of Hornby's new HM DCC Bluetooth control system.

MIKE WILD gets to grips with this new way to control your trains and assesses its value.

8-pin, 6-pin and Next18 formats together with optional Power Bank capacitors to add stay alive capacity to the chips. To complete the line-up there is a range of track power connection options to allow simple and cost-effective setup of a digital model railway with Bluetooth control.

# **APP CONTROL**

Hornby has created a brand-new app interface for the HM DCC products. It is well designed with a sleek look to its colouring and allows management of locomotive profiles, driving characteristics, sound functions and CV values.

The most impressive part of the app is that it communicates with HM DCC Bluetooth chip fitted locomotives without the need to send signals via the track. You do still need track power to run the models, but there is no need for a traditional DCC base station anymore. All the communication is now carried out by Bluetooth, removing the occasional unreliability of track based signals.

In reality you don't notice this, but the result is full control of your models no matter what the circumstances.

Setup of the app requires a Hornby account – a simple email and password process which takes less than two minutes to complete. Once that is done you are ready to start navigating the HM DCC controller interface for which Hornby includes links to tutorials to get you started.

Track power can come from an existing DCC system - for example, you can just leave your Elite connected and take control of Bluetooth chip fitted models through the smartphone app – or alternatively if you are using the new HM DCC system exclusively on your layout, you can use a Hornby power supply connected direct to the track with an adapter cable. Thirdly, you can use a 12V analogue power supply, but note that this will need to be turned up to full power and only non-sound locomotives can be operated.

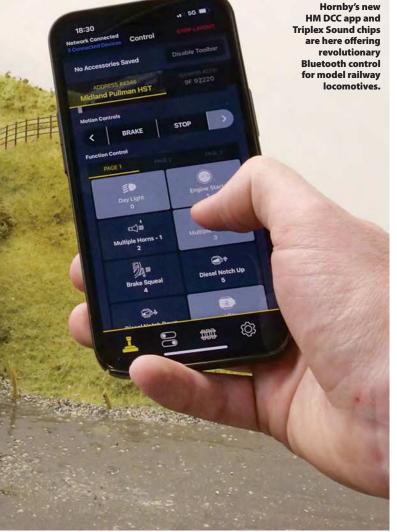
Once you are past these steps, you need a locomotive with a Bluetooth enabled chip on board. We started out by fitting a pair of Hornby HST power cars with a pair of HM DCC TXS sound 21-pin decoders and then followed the process on the app to link them to our smartphone.

Now the really clever part starts. The Triplex Sound (TXS) chips are factory loaded with a generic steam sound, but via the HM DCC app you can change the sound profile on the chip within ten minutes from the available profiles as all of the data transfer is handled by Bluetooth. This meant that our HST was decoder fitted with stay alive Power Banks and received a new sound profile on each power car within 20 minutes.

The app caters for both Bluetooth and standard DCC driving, but you will need the app to select between the two. Switching to DCC means the chips can be driven by any other control system and a simple slider on the app makes the switch.

Acceleration and deceleration characteristics can be managed in a similar way while the locomotive functions can also be reviewed. CV data can be read over Bluetooth too and took around 10-15 seconds to read all the chip data – much quicker than through conventional programming tracks.

There are many positive aspects to the new HM DCC app, but there are a couple of areas which caught our attention. There isn't a direct means of running two locomotives, for example HST power cars, >>>

together at the same time without adjusting CV value (CV19). However, that is now much easier through the app than before.

In addition, we found that the long address allocated in the app didn't transfer to the locomotives which meant that we needed to readdress the chips to run on standard DCC control using other systems. That aside, we found the the app quick to navigate and, just as importantly, very quick to make adjustments to a locomotive's performance and sound volume.

# **TRIPLEX SOUND**

The new Triplex Sound (TXS) decoders are a step up from the previous Twin Track Sound (TTS) chips. The new TXS chips can play three sound channels at once which increases their realism while there are also now more socket choices too with 21-pin, 8-pin and Next18 currently available. One point to note is that the Next18 chip is larger than other brands to incorporate the Bluetooth circuits which does mean that it won't fit into some of the smaller 'OO' gauge or 'N' gauge locomotives.

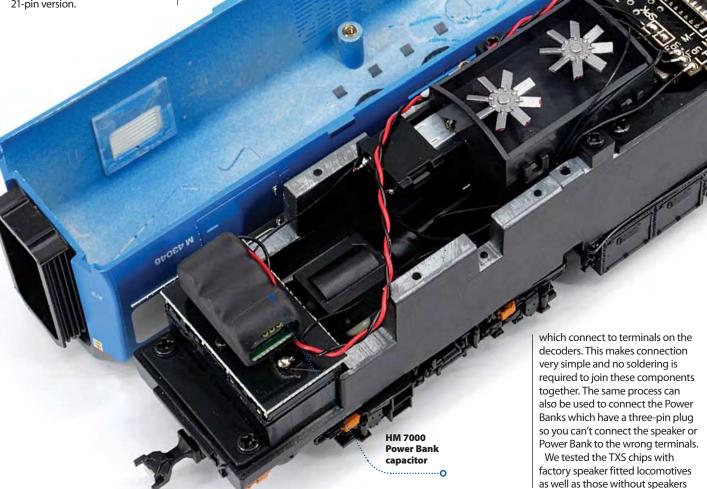
All decoder systems can provide 1Amp of power to the locomotive while also controlling lighting and sound functions. Sizes range from 28mm x 14mm for the Next18 TXS chip to 30mm x 15mm for the 21-pin version.

The TXS chip family all have Bluetooth connectivity to work with the HM DCC app. They can also be controlled through conventional DCC, but will require the app for sound profile changes.

The chips are very well designed and consider the installation process. Each of the sound chips comes with a 15mm x 11mm cube speaker which has a self-adhesive backing which allows it to be fitted into pre-built sound enclosures in locomotives like the Hornby '9F' or to be used in conjunction with the supplied sprue of enclosures. The enclosures on the sprue have footprints measuring 15mm x 11mm, 30mm x 11mm and 40mm x

20mm with three different depths available for the 15mm and 30mm long designs to suit different locomotives.

Better still, the speakers come pre-wired with two-pin plugs

**OVERALL** 

Hornby's new HM DCC app control and TXS sound chips are a fascinating and impressive new choice for digital layout control. The chips are designed to allow their operation with Bluetooth and conventional DCC systems while if you are completely new to DCC, your power supply can be as simple as a Hornby 4Amp power supply connected to the track through a new adapter cable.

The HM DCC app is free to download for use with smartphones and tablets while the 4Amp power supply and adapter cable cost £59.99. A TXS sound chip is priced at £69.99 – all good value in our book when you consider that

Installation is quick and simple on the latest locomotives. This Hornby'9F' had a pre-built speaker enclosure to suit the 15mm x 11mm cube design and a 21-pin decoder socket. The decoder can be loaded with Hornby's sound profiles from the app via Bluetooth.

a full DCC system plus, for example, a typical ESU or ZIMO sound chip would cost in the region of £400.

The functionality of the app is outstanding and its ability to programme and control locomotives by Bluetooth is a real revolution in model railway technology. The new TXS decoders have clearly been designed with the end user in mind and, importantly, through the use of NMRA compliant socket types they can be used with any brand of model railway locomotive they will physically fit.

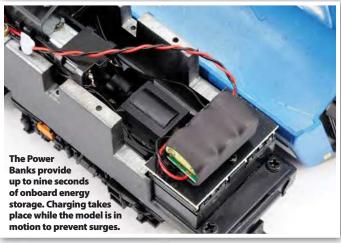
The first wave of sound profiles

is now available in the app and we hope this range will continue to develop with Hornby in the coming months to deliver a greater choice of sound profiles to suit its extensive range of steam and diesel locomotives.

First impressions count and our first steps into Bluetooth control with HM DCC and Triplex Sound have been both rewarding and successful. We can't wait to explore it more in future issues.

# AGONS

The late-1950s saw the introduction of the Palbrick wagon fleet for the transport of bricks. MIKE WILD inspects the first ever ready-to-run 'OO' gauge model of these distinctive wagons from KR Models.

B462754 **KR Models' latest rolling** stock release is the BR Palbrick B. The wagons are offered in triple packs with unique running numbers on each vehicle.

ONSIDERING that 1,423 Palbrick wagons were built in the late 1950s by British

Railways, it is surprising that these four-wheel brick wagons have never been available as a ready-to-run model before.

However, KR Models has set the modifications as frame only wagons used for the transport of shell cases.

The Palbrick was introduced to replace ageing designs of LNER heritage on the British Railway network. There were three build types – A, B and C – the earliest A variants rated at 13tons while the later B and C wagons were able to carry 16tons each. Unfortunately brick traffic by rail didn't last long and during the 1960s the fleet was withdrawn with the remaining vehicles converted as barrier wagons as well as shell case wagons while some were used for the transport of steel coils with the original sides removed.

For review we received a triple pack of BR bauxite Palbrick B wagons from KR Models. On opening the box we were impressed by their weight, but did notice that one of handles and a frame support had been

dislodged in transit, so be careful when opening the boxes in case there are loose parts. A couple of minutes and a dot of superglue returned both parts promptly to their original positions.

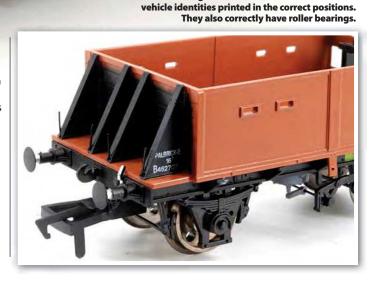
Construction of the model is principally injection moulded and mirrors the appearance of the real wagons well. This includes side panels with twin openings, screw adjusted braces to stabilise the brick load in transit, separately fitted but fixed buffers and a coupling hook at the centre of the buffer beam.

The underframe is again injection

moulded and features neatly moulded W irons, spring detail and roller bearing axleboxes while there are turned metal wheels with pinpoint axles on each wagon as well as small tension lock couplings in NEM pockets.

Paint application is well done and each of the wagons in the triple pack is uniquely numbered.

These new Palbrick B wagons are a great addition from KR Models which are keenly priced at £50 for a triple pack. Steam era modellers will be pleased to finally see these distinctive brick wagons available ready-to-run. (MW)

# HELJAN'S UPGRADED 100335

ELJAN'S well-regarded 'OO' gauge Class 33s are back sporting a series of upgrades.

Amongst the latest batch of models are Hastings gauge Class 33/2 Bo-Bo diesels in original guise with all-new exhaust arrangements for the first time and improved Class 33/1 push-pull variants.

Built in the late 1950s/early 1960s by the Birmingham Railway Carriage and Wagon Company (BRCW), almost 100 Type 3 Bo-Bo diesel locomotives were built for use on BR's Southern Region. Of these, the final 12 (D6586-D6597) were constructed for use on the restricted Tonbridge to Hastings line. This restricted loading gauge required the locomotive bodies to be several inches narrower than the standard examples (8ft 8in) so they could negotiate the limited clearance in tunnels along the route.

A batch of 19 locomotives were also converted to push-pull operation in the 1960s for use with 4-TC trailer units in connection with BR Southern Region's Bournemouth route electrification for the final non-electrified stretch between Bournemouth and Weymouth.

# **THE MODELS**

Turning our attention to the restricted gauge example, Heljan revealed plans to release its 'OO' gauge model of the small batch of 'Slim Jim' Class 33/2s in 2006, but until now the model has featured the later roof and exhaust arrangement.

Now five new versions have been produced featuring the original exhaust arrangement for the first time finished as D6586 in BR green (Cat No. 3375), D6594 in weathered BR green (3379), D6591 in BR green with small yellow panels (3376), D6596 in BR green with full yellow ends (3378) and D6590 in BR blue with full yellow ends (3377).

Our Class 33/2 review sample represents D6591 which entered traffic in February 1962, allocated to Hither Green depot on the Southern Region's South Eastern Division. It was later reallocated to St Leonard's depot near Hastings for the next four years before it

was reallocated again to Hither
Green in 1967. Here the locomotive

Green in 1967. Here the locomotive remained until the mid-1980s when it was allocated to Stewart's Lane depot (by now renumbered 33206). It was withdrawn in 1996 and scrapped early in the following year at Eastleigh.

As with previous Class 33/2 models, these have a heavy diecast chassis, darkened metal wheels, wire metal handrails, neat glazing and separately fitted windscreen wipers, but the main changes are to the roof area of the model. This area on D6591 features a newly-tooled exhaust and silencer section at the No. 2 end, painted silver and certainly looks the part.

In addition, this model also features the original style of roof panel fastening bolts (in later life these were replaced with fastening clips), original cantrail grilles, together with roof mounted ventilators and air horn roof covers. On our review sample there were no lamp irons at each end, but Heljan has confirmed that these will be on the production models.

Decoration is up to the high standard we have come to expect from Heljan with an evenly applied BR lined green colour scheme with grey roof, white cab surrounds and bodyside stripe, red buffer beams and neatly applied small yellow warning panels with crisp right-angled edges. British Railways crests and small Blue Star coupling codes have been crisply applied, as are the numbers. Route indicator panels are also well defined behind







the glazing, displaying EB at one end and G2 at the other. As with previous releases, these are fairly simple to replace should you wish to change them, although we found the bodyshell was a snug fit on our example.

Looking a little closer at Heljan's Class 33/1 push-pull variant, our review sample was finished as 33108 in Fragonset's black livery, relieved by a bodyside red stripe and grey roof. Detailing is as per previous releases of the Class 33/1 with separately fitted push-pull jumper cables at each end, later condition roof fixings and exhaust port, exposed air horn apertures, separately fitted lamp irons and high-intensity headlights set in the centre of each cab front. Headcodes are set as 24 at the No. 1 end and blank white squares at the other.

As with the Class 33/2, application of the Fragonset livery was

very good with crisp lettering, numbers and labels. Jumper cables and sockets are also painted accordingly – some (as with the 33/2) with electrification flashes now printed on them, adding to the quality feel.

# PERFORMANCE

The chassis on both versions of the Class 33 have also been upgraded and now feature 21-pin Digital Command Control decoder sockets and a new on/off switch for the LED directional lighting. This, incidentally, has an effective off-white/yellowy hue about it,

while the Printed Circuit Board also now features pre-fitted speaker wires through a plug and socket arrangement, to aid the installation of digital sound. On test, our review samples ran smoothly and quietly through the speed range.

Each also comes with a small detail pack including optional snowploughs and small tension lock couplings, while sprung metal buffers, factory-fitted screw-link couplings (33/2)/lowered cosmetic buckeye couplings (33/1) and NEM coupler pockets complete these latest editions of the manufacturer's popular Class 33s. (MC)

# EXPANDS HORNBY PIONEER COLLECTION

HE early development of the British railway system is fascinating. Progress was so swift that locomotive designs were out of date within years, not decades, and the need for greater power to haul longer trains over greater distances at increased speeds only intensified.

Amongst the early railway locomotives were the two 0-4-2 Luggage Engines ordered from Todd, Kitson and Laird by the Liverpool and Manchester Railway in a book set, just like the first editions of Rocket and

presented

in 1837. They were part of an order for ten locomotives which also comprised Banking and Coaching engines. The two locomotives were numbered 57 Lion and 58 Tiger which were completed in 1838. Lion was by far the best known while Tiger saw out its short lifespan which came to an end in 1850, working a mixture of passenger and freight trains with its final duties seeing the 0-4-2 relegated to ballast trains.

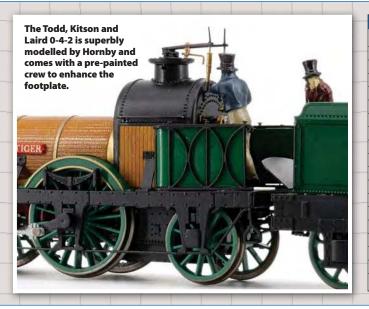
Hornby's model of Tiger was announced in its 2023 catalogue and is a worthy successor to Lion (HM186). It is finished in its later condition following rebuilding and features a stovepipe chimney, plain black topped firebox while its livery is also more subtle than that carried by Lion as it features black frames.

Detailing of the model is very well done and includes superbly made open side splashers over the driving wheels, a neatly produced chimney and smokebox with cylinder detail at the base while there is also excellent attention to

detail in the moulded and painted finish of the boiler barrel. The firebox follows the style of the real locomotive according to the few images available of Tiger while the 0-4-2 is paired with the same four-wheel tender as the model of Lion.

the detail continues with fine brake rigging and connecting rods between the wheels while underneath the slide bars from the cylinders are modelled together with the inside frames.

Like the first edition of *Lion*, *Tiger* is offered in a boxed train pack which is smartly presented in a book style. This contains the locomotive together with three coal wagons as well as a pre-painted crew which can be positioned on the footplate using the mounting holes provided. The wagons are neatly presented in plain brown and look remarkably small when compared with the

typical 10ft wheelbase wagons we are used to seeing from the British Railways steam era.

Couplings are Hornby's plastic chains which take a little care to locate onto the coupling spigots on each wagon and the locomotive tender, but it is effort which is worthwhile as this pioneering train looks superb out on the track. Additional wagons are being produced with release anticipated in Autumn 2023.

Inside the locomotive is a three-pole motor which ran smoothly and quietly throughout our tests on both analogue and digital control systems. For those looking to upgrade to DCC, there is a Next18 decoder socket mounted in the firebox with access through the base, while sound fitters will be pleased to know that there is a factory fitted 15mm x 11mm cube speaker positioned in the tender

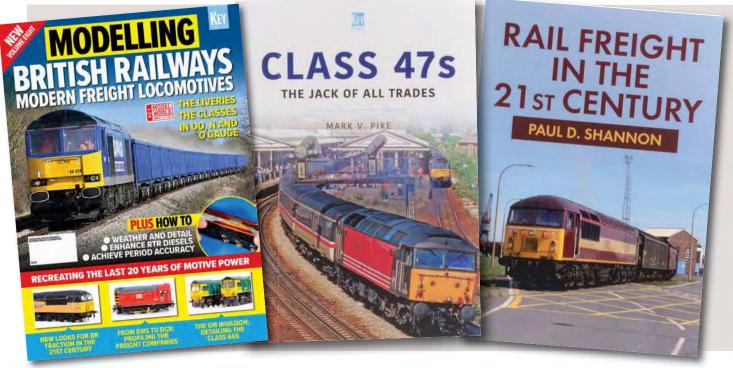

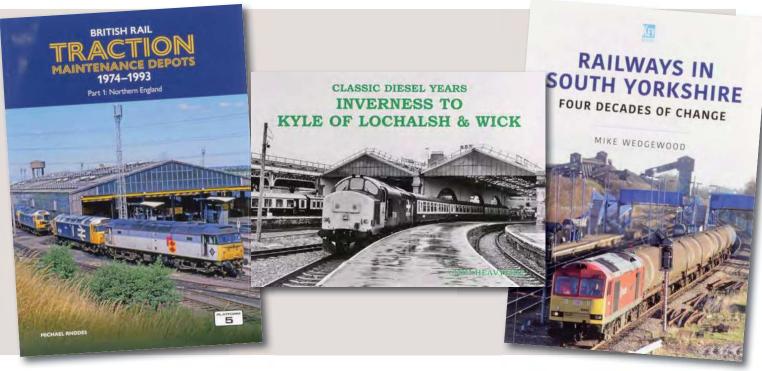
Gathering a super collection of photographs, the author has managed to include a wide variety of traction along with the amazing array of wagons that could be seen around the freight terminals, ports and inland.

HE railway across South Yorkshire has changed significantly since the 1970s and this latest book from Key Publishing recalls how the rail network has adapted since then to the present day scene. There have been closures, traction has changed and the collieries on which the railway was so dependent have gone too. But the railway still plays an important role for freight and passenger traffic and this volume reflects some of the changes through the years.

The author opens the book with a brief introduction on how the railway developed in South Yorkshire, followed by chapters on specific areas including Rotherham and the Midland Main Line, the Sheffield area, the Barnsley coalfield and concluding with Doncaster and the East Coast Main Line.

The album contains many reminders of long since withdrawn traction and closed infrastructure, especially colliery branch lines and yards which act as a reminder of how freight traffic has changed over time.

Double-headed Class 20s and Class 56s on coal trains, Class 47s on LPG tanks, Class 76s on rakes of steel open mineral wagons and Class 45s and 'Deltics' on passenger trains are reminders of the area's rich railway heritage. But there are plenty of colourful contemporary views of modern-day operations too.

Photographic reproduction is superb throughout, printed on fine quality paper, with many of the archival images as crisp and clear as some of the more recent inclusions, which is a real bonus and testament to the quality of the original material. (JN)

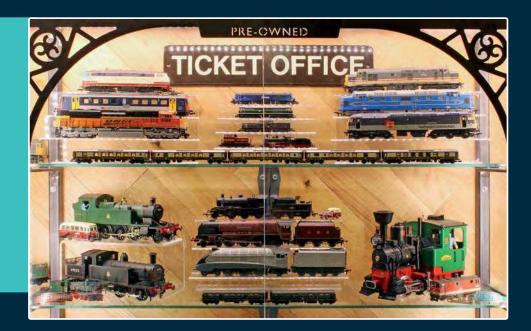

Hornby's latest generation Mk 3 carriages have been designed with the manufacturer's new magnetic switched lighting strips in mind. **MIKE WILD** adds a full set to a Blue Pullman HST set in 'OO' gauge. TOOLS

NTERIOR LIGHTING adds a new level of interest to model railway rolling stock, particularly if you have the option for night running on your layout. To enhance its new range of BR Mk 3 carriages, Hornby has introduced a Maglight lighting strip which is simple to install.

The Maglights have been created with simplicity in mind. They are battery powered and each strip has ten LEDs as well as a magnetic reed switch and a magnetic block to operate the switch. The coaches have also been created with this system in mind down to a spare screw in the lighting support bar and a battery enclosure

space in the underframe.

Installation takes around ten minutes per coach and starts with dismantling of the vehicle for access to its internal components. From here there is further dismantling required as the lighting support bar and seat moulding both have to be removed to complete the addition of the lighting strip. However, while that sounds challenging, everything comes apart and goes back together well. So well, in fact, that we have completed nine coaches for this project.

In addition to the lighting, we also took the opportunity to change the couplings on each coach to Hornby's new magnetic buckeye

design. These couplings are included with each Mk 3 coach and, as well as offering close coupling between coaches, also make it much quicker and easier coupling and uncoupling vehicles when assembling a train.

Our first step before adding the lights is to change the couplings from small tension locks to Hornby's new magnetic design included with the Mk 3s.

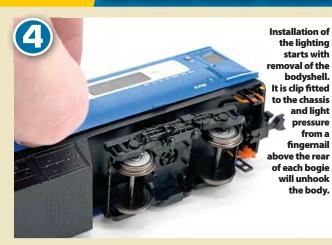


Replacing the coupling is a simple case of pulling out the small tension lock from the NEM pocket and clipping the magnetic version into place. You will need to ensure that the magnetic coupling is the correct way up for the next coach.

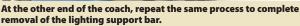






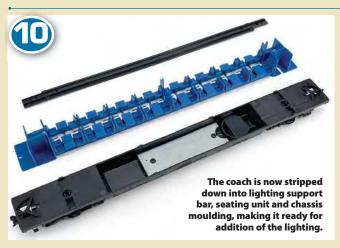








In order to install the lighting, the seat moulding also needs to be removed. Two screws hold it in place - one at each end. Note its orientation is marked by the lugs on the chassis floor protruding through this end.

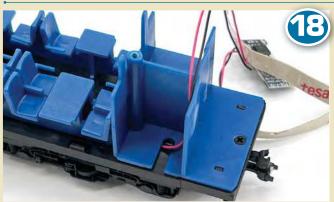

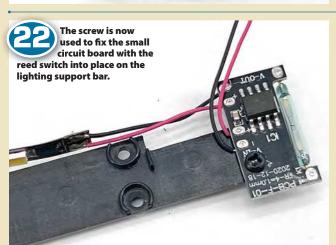


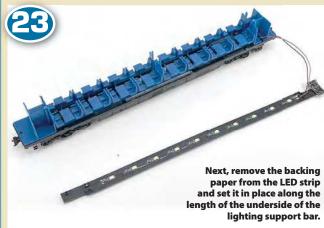
Viewed from below, the position of the coupling is clear - it should sit straight and level if set right. If not, remove the screw at the offending end of the seating unit, reseat the coupling and refit the screw to hold the seating unit in place.





A screw to hold the reed switch circuit board is factory fitted into the lighting support bar. Remove it using a crosshead screwdriver.









Reassembly of the carriage interior components is the reverse of dismantling, but take care to ensure no wires are verstretched or caught. Bundle the spare wire into the toilet compartment and then refit the body.

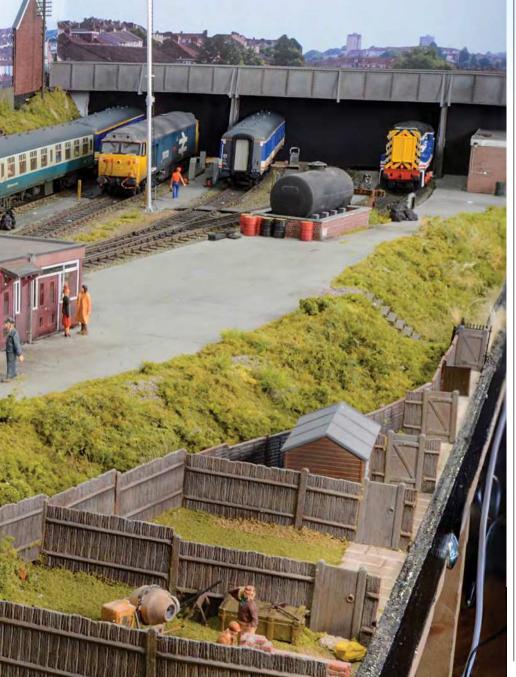
# Parsons Vale

As a self-confessed 'dabbler', **DAVID JONES** gave an old 'OO' gauge layout set around Bristol a new home and revitalised it to show the final years of the Class 50s in homage to these popular machines.

HAVE always been what you might call a 'dabbler' with model railways. For a while I have focused on the aspects of the hobby I enjoy, which are running trains and photographing the smaller details rather than building a bespoke layout. Eventually I decided to search for a pre-built layout I could alter to my tastes and that would fit in the car.

I had set myself the task to see if there was anything available for sale that I could offer a new home that was reasonably priced. I think I found that in Parsons Vale. If you look through the major auction sites you often find that people want hundreds of pounds for a basic 8ft x 4ft track plan and with the costs of everything increasing, finding a bargain is difficult but I'm glad I took a chance on Parsons Vale.

# **INSPIRATION**

The origins of the layout are based around locations such as Malago Vale carriage sidings near Bristol - now long disappeared – and a bridge that the builder used to pass over at Parson Street, hence the name Parsons Vale. The premise for operation is that the sidings are located just beyond the main station, with empty stock workings between the two locations. These empty stock formations are then marshalled within the sidings, ready to be despatched for their next turn of duty.

The layout currently sits in my office in the garden. Working from home, it's a nice distraction from the day job to turn around and move a train or two. It also causes a fair few off-topic conversations to liven up virtual meetings.

The layout has previously been exhibited mainly in the South West and will continue its tour of the UK in the >>>

North West in 2023. One of the reasons I purchased it was for that element: I enjoy going to exhibitions and working layouts, as well as meeting people.

Although the builder, Rob Owst, did a great job, I have made a few changes. The original baseboard is on 2in x 1in timber with an open frame construction to allow for the landscaping and bridges. I've made those supports thicker to alleviate signs of bowing that were beginning to appear and this was also handy for the swap to Digital Command Control (DCC) as the Cobalt Digital IP motors are larger than the Peco ones used, so the larger bracing added some support and protection.

The layout is split over two boards - the scenic 5ft section and a separate storage yard board that attaches to the side. I've replaced the original 4ft storage yard board with a 5ft Grainge & Hodder traverser to provide a few more options than the fixed yard previously did and it also means I can use this storage yard for other layouts.

Parsons Vale was previously analogue controlled, but I prefer the flexibility and capability of DCC. Following a visit to DCC Concepts' store in Settle, the layout is now entirely digital. The points are operated by DCC Concepts Cobalt IP Digital point motors, and these are worked by a mimic panel on the front – one of the newer style panels which I think is a huge improvement. Having chosen to go digital, I have selected the NCE Powercab as my control system and I am adding digital sound decoders to my diesel fleet, which will add a new dimension to operation.

Some of my favourite aspects of the layout are the subtle cameos in the scene. These range from the window cleaner (who has been affectionately named James by my son, after my stepdad who's a window cleaner) to the builders in the garden at the front. Carl the fitter, named after a friend who works at Allerton, has been a feature of most of my part-builds and he makes a return in the middle of the carriage siding. For me, it wouldn't be a layout without a Carl!

Further detailed modelling work to the layout is still required: the three-lane road looks too busy, even if it is accurate

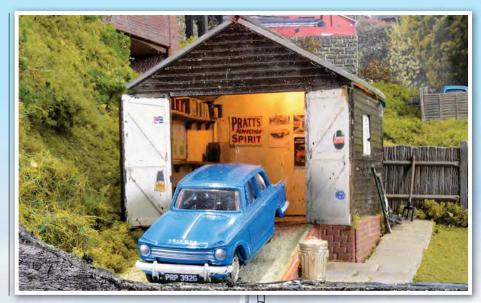


for the period, so I plan to reduce this to two lanes with the addition of an under-construction bus stop in the third lane. This should allow me to add some workmen, roadworks and other fine details to enhance that section of the layout, with

its own focal point to draw the eye.

The front fascia board is also set to be replaced, but retaining the original idea that the front panel folds onto itself to contain everything in one box.

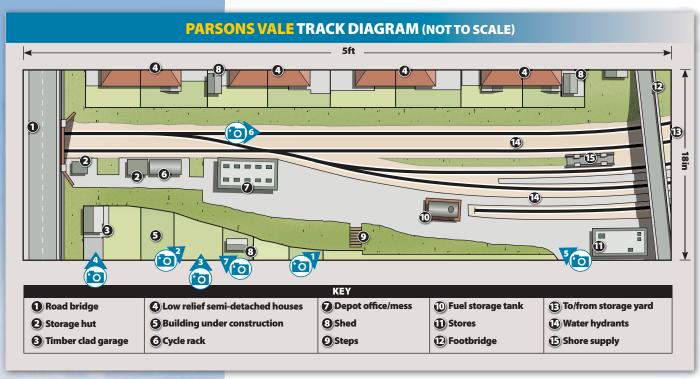
**THE TRAINS**Originally the layout fleet was a mixture of BR blue era diesels, with Class 47s, 50s, 52s and so on, but I wanted to bring that forward a touch whilst not losing the sense of location in the Bristol area. Primarily, I now operate the layout with Class 50s during their final years in the South West. There are other locomotives from the >>

general Network SouthEast fleet at the time, but the layout now effectively pays homage to the big English-Electric diesels.

I have three detailed and weathered Class 50s, but I think 50033 *Glorious* and 50046 *Ajax* look the closest in appearance to the real machines at the time. One is soundfitted, so I now just need to get the other two completed.

I thought that operation would be rather limited, but the movements required to assemble the rakes of coaches, run locomotives around them and take them off-scene is quite surprising. I now need to find a suitable set of freight locomotives to cater for the non-passenger movements on the layout. The plan is to add some Class 31 and Class 33 diesels to the roster in due course.

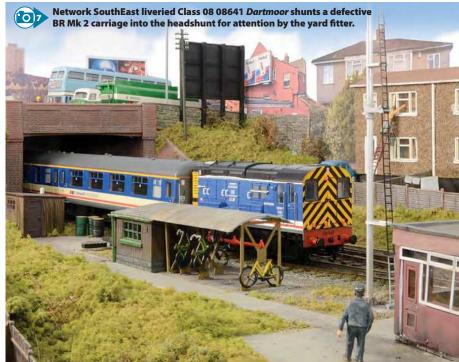
#### **A REAL BARGAIN**

I bought Parsons Vale as something to dabble with and take to shows, and it has certainly lived up to expectation. My aim has been to recapture the sense of a rapidly changing but colourful railway scene in the final half of the 1980s and first half of the 1990s, and I'd like to think that I have achieved that with the tweaks I have made to the running and appearance of the layout.

It goes to show that no matter what your interest is in railway modelling, you can always find a way of bringing it to fruition and sometimes that's through purchasing a layout and adding your own personal touches.

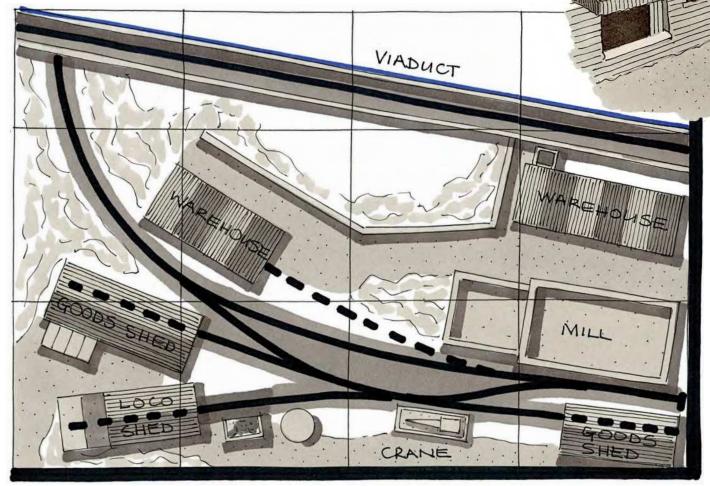

Rather than building a new layout to replace one you're happy with, **PAUL LUNN** argues that changing the scene can be just as enjoyable - and much cheaper.

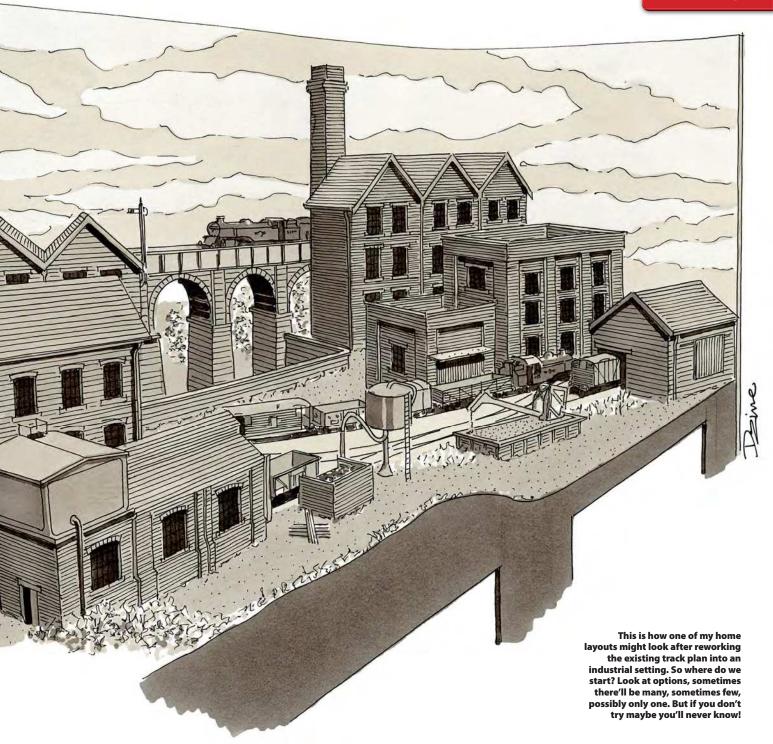
OW MANY OF US HAVE found ourselves in a situation where you have a proven, reliable track plan for a layout that's realistic to

operate and fun - but despite all of that you hanker for a change of scene? The obvious thing to do is to start again, but that's time-consuming and costly - and environmental issues of discarding material are coming to the fore. What about taking a fresh look at what you already have? Where do we start? Firstly, look >>>



Having mocked up my intended plan, there were several revisions. This version of the plan resulted in the locomotive shed placed front left, the loading dock and crane moved onto the loop and a more dominant warehouse grouping has been created in the distance. I've also suggested adding an additional kickback siding (dashed line on plan) and whilst tight in headshunt capacity, it's worth it for increased operational value.

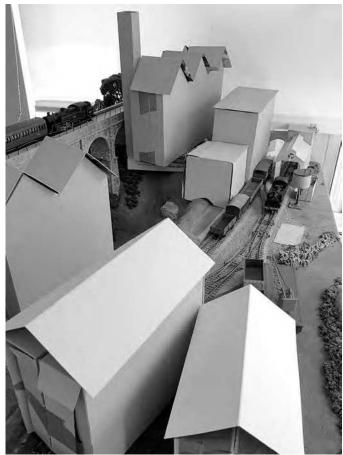


The greatest thing about a mock-up is that, unlike a drawing, you can view it from any angle. Note how there's a balance between left and right-hand side tree grouping with one solitary tree, right, that is a bit taller to avoid visual repetition.

There's nothing wrong with adding real structures in amongst your cardboard mock-ups and here you see my adapted Dapol locomotive shed with rooftop water tank. The location and variation of different rooftops is good but the size of some buildings isn't. The gable ended building needs to have extra depth from front to back. Similarly, the rear structure with chimney could also benefit from greater depth.

This opposite handed version repositions the locomotive shed, moves the loading dock and crane onto the loop and creates a more dominant warehouse grouping in the distance. Do I have a preference between the two arrangements? It's a hard call, but if I had to choose it would be locomotive shed on the left and the additional siding.

at options for change. Sometimes there will be many, but there might only be a few or even one. One thing is certain though - if you don't spend some time looking and thinking about alternatives, you'll never know!

My existing, partly finished 4ft x 4ft rural layout has a large slightly diagonally positioned aqueduct visually separating two key scenes. There are numerous trees and grass covered hills. This will be the baseline from which I'll mock-up a completely different interpretation.

#### **MOCKING UP**

Mocking up a layout design is a great way to assess how it will look without expending too much time and money. Some of my previous examples are very basic in their appearance, whilst others have been quite advanced.

I developed a micro layout with a curved front edge designed to fit in a 2ft-3ft square space. The design made use of Hornby ¼ scale track templates, easily adjusted to suit location and design requirement. It also utilised used cereal packets, corrugated packing card and cocktail sticks for tree trunks.

Front left, there was an engine shed with colliery screens behind. Front right featured a low-relief bridge masking the exit to a non-scenic cassette, and a weighbridge lean-to with a locomotive servicing shed behind. To the rear there was a hill from four layers of corrugated card. It took several attempts to

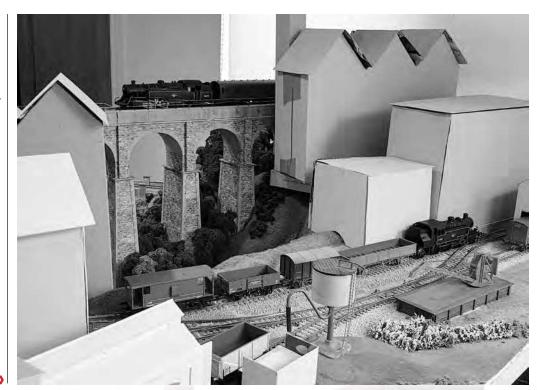

achieve this pleasing composition with the hill masking a non-scenic track, served from a sector plate hidden inside the screens.

Another layout plan was inspired by Clifton suspension bridge. The mock-up helped me decide whether Hornby's Grand Suspension Bridge would be overpowering in length and height. As the left-hand end represented a station at ground level, I wanted to make sure I could find a suitable height backscene that would look effective with both levels. Furthermore, could the arrangement hide the River Avon's three-dimensional end where it meets the two-dimensional backscene behind the outer elevated end span of the bridge.

A modeller friend also approached me for help with his planned wartime diorama. In a depth of only 2ft he wanted to know if he could use 'O' gauge track in the foreground, and 'OO' gauge track to the rear, with the area between the two reducing in )>





scale to create a forced perspective. Again, a mock-up helped in terms of developing the potential scene.

Don't just think of mock-ups as a method for complete schemes: they also work for specific details. I've always been an advocate of adding a short additional section between scenic layout and non-scenic storage yard, purposely designed to hide a hole in the backscene and enabling track to pass more discretely between the two.

#### **MATERIALS**

From a reuse point of view, cereal boxes and corrugated card figure high on my materials list. Expanded polystyrene whilst ethically questionable often comes to our house by way of packaging. This is a material I try to use more for full size mock-ups as any hills made can be transferred as a time saving device, onto the finished model. There are some things I buy new wooden barbecue skewers, cocktail sticks, coffee stirrers and the like.

I regularly make extensive use of used cereal packaging. You can use them just as they are, printed side out, but I find the graphics distracting. I always turn them inside out. Carefully open them up on the long vertical join line at one corner, re-fold all fold lines the opposite way and stick the thing back together.

You can use glue but I tend to use tape as it allows me subject. Always look at a to easily unpick number of real locations the structure if I first. There's a wealth of need to make any modifications later.

From adapted online. boxes you can create a building representation with flat, gable or hipped roofs. I always tend to make mock-up buildings a little on the high side at first so that when placed in position I can adjust height to taste:



Mock-ups are just one part of the process. There are times when it's important to make a mock-up trial model. This test piece for a future colliery railway shows a section of dipping track. Of particular note are the slightly 'flooded' sleepers, and autumnal vegetation made from garden twine and unused tea leaves.

#### **DESIGN CLEVER**

I start by planning most things in my head and want to fill much of the area with substantial structures and tracks weaving their way between neighbouring buildings. Some gaps between track and bridge are larger than others and ideal for buildings with a large footprint. That's the best place for them too, so as not to obstruct your viewpoint.

Most ready-to-plant structures are of a size and of the largest, most don't represent the true scale of the original type of structure. When measured against passing trains,

many warehouses and mills dominate the scene. Layouts are always a fine

balance in size, volume and creating the right look. Kits like those from the Metcalfe range

and some downloaded versions can be adapted, although a

It is also worth bearing in mind that if you make changes to a section of a layout there may be visual implications for any neighbouring section, so mockups can certainly help in the first instance and also be on the lookout for attractive cameo views or arrangements.

#### **OVERALL BENEFITS**

Mock-ups are a great way to resolve design issues. You get an idea of the end result before laying out any cash and real time. You can adjust items, perhaps with less or more volume in height or width, or change a gable ended roof for a flat one, as I did, and all you need is some decent size scrap card, tape and/or glue and a few basic tools. Happy planning!

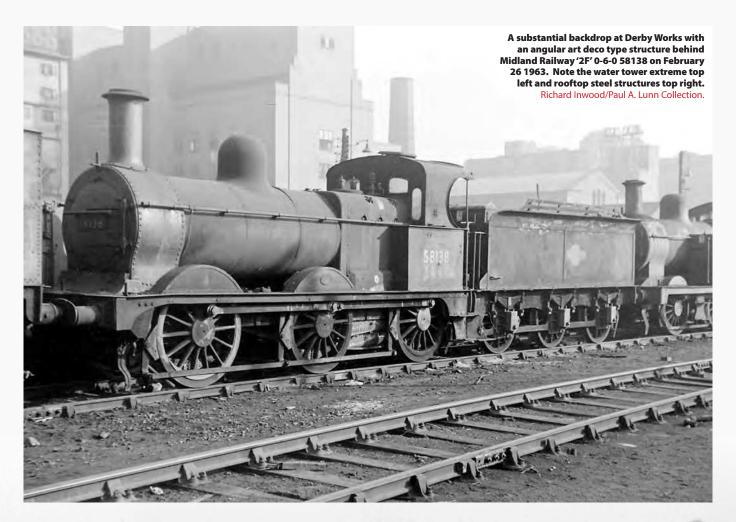

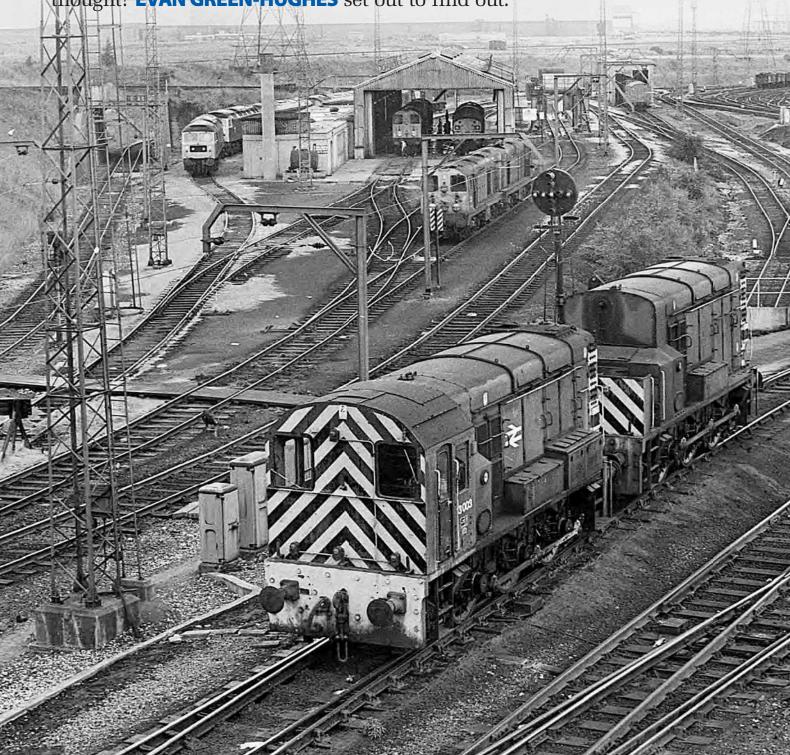






# Beeching THE GOOD BITS

While the Beeching report of 60 years ago is best remembered for the closure of a third of our railway network, it proposed investment and improvement in some areas, particularly freight and long-distance passenger services. Some of these proposals were then seen as radical, but were they as original as generally thought? **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** set out to find out.

N the last issue of Hornby Magazine (HM190) we examined how the Beeching report was in reality an acceleration of policies that had been already under way, in some cases for many years, and which had already involved the closure of many miles of railway line in the UK. However, the report was not entirely about retrenchment as it contained proposals for extensive modernisation and investment in the system. Included in these were new marshalling yards, the Freightliner container service, Merry-Go-Round working for coal trains as well as the establishment of a network of fast inter-city passenger routes.

Perhaps one of the most successful initiatives included in the Beeching Report was that of block container freight trains, which were to run at express speeds between dedicated terminals in an effort to compete with road transport. The name 'Freightliner' was coined for this operation, although the term 'Liner Train' was used in the report itself, and it was to become very successful, laying the foundations for the extensive use of containers that continues to this day. While Beeching is largely credited with this initiative, it was in reality a logical progression of what had gone before, and took into account developments in the rest of the world.

In fact, by the time Beeching reported, British Railways already had container trains although they used equipment built to Railway Clearing House specifications that dated back to 1923. These, however, resembled normal goods wagons, being made of wood, and were of limited capacity, yet had been built in large numbers, being used particularly for perishables and door-to-door goods services. Most of these were used singly as required and ran in normal mixed goods trains although dedicated block trains did appear in 1959 when the London Midland Region launched its daily 'Condor' container train between London and Scotland, a service which saw 27 wagons of goods worked non-stop at speeds which the road transport of the day could not hope to match.

Clearly there was a place for container traffic but, even before Beeching, it was realised that the existing wooden containers were becoming outdated. As a result, in 1961, a larger square type made of steel was introduced for a new service called 'Speedfreight'. These were larger than the wooden ones but still small enough that they could be accommodated on four-wheel wagons. The new service ran from London to Manchester and special handling equipment was installed to load and unload the containers.

Meanwhile, in the rest of the world, the use of much larger steel containers was becoming widespread. The first ship designed to carry them was introduced in 1957 and adaptors for securing them on trains and road lorries came soon after. This method of transport was then extensively used by the American military in the supply of their troops during the Vietnam conflict. International standards for container size and mountings soon followed and it was these that were proposed for the introduction of the Freightliner network, which was very successful and at its height was responsible for running 140 trains a day in and out of 30 different terminals.

#### **MERRY-GO-ROUND**

Another initiative from the Beeching Report that worked very well was the introduction of Merry-Go-Round (MGR) trains with the intention of making the transport of coal more economic. Again, the idea of working coal in block trains was not new for such trains, in this case made up of strings of unbraked four-wheel wagons, had been used on the network for many years, particularly running from the Midlands to London.

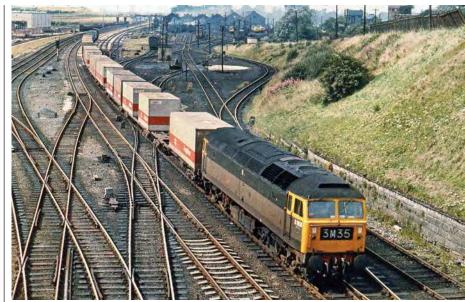
The introduction of the Clean Air Acts had seen the destination for much of this traffic move from retail domestic merchants in cities to power stations but the method of working had not altered so that at the time of the report the average wagon was only making a couple of journeys a week from colliery to power station and most were still being unloaded by hand. Despite the quantity of coal being moved by rail, the traffic only generated £2.8m profit a year and it was estimated that about £11m was being wasted by the inefficient use of wagons.

However, there were instances where other forms of traffic were more efficiently handled, for instance iron ore for steelworks in the north east ran in block trains using wagons equipped with bottom discharge doors, while for around 30 years limestone had been conveyed from Derbyshire in bogie hoppers with purposebuilt loading and unloading facilities.

Beeching proposed using some of the lessons learned from these operations for the transport of coal but with the added twist that wagons should be loaded and unloaded while the train was on the move. The result of this was the MGR coal train which was designed to be loaded and unloaded more efficiently and could run at higher speeds, enabling each set of wagons to make multiple journeys in each day.

Cockenzie power station in Scotland was the first to be converted to the new system, which eventually became the industry standard. It is a sign of how successful this policy was that the 80 wagons deployed to Cockenzie were able to replace no fewer than 1,500 of the old four-wheelers. As a result of this initiative coal trains remained a prominent traffic on our railways until the recent decimation of the coal industry caused its demise.

At the time of the Beeching Report 89m tons of general merchandise still travelled by rail, much of it in individual wagons, and although this brought in over £100m a year it was losing around £1m a week.

The reason for this had been identified many years previously and was due to the number of stations handling goods traffic, the cost of running pick-up goods trains and the time and cost expended in shunting and re-marshalling trains so that each wagon ended up at its intended destination.

Rather surprisingly Beeching came to the conclusion that much of this traffic could be saved, but that to do that most of the smaller yards should be closed, with shunting to be carried out at new, massive hump-equipped yards. Again, this was not a new idea, as this form of shunting had been in use since introduced in Liverpool in 1882, but what Beeching did was to introduce such yards in many more areas, at considerable expense.

Unfortunately, unlike some of the other initiatives this policy did not work as the stations that had provided the traffic were closed and road transport provided a more flexible and cost-efficient way of making short-distance deliveries. This was one way of working that had provided efficiencies in the past but failed to do so this time, and it was not long before wagonload freight passed into oblivion.

#### **EXPRESS OPERATION**

Perhaps one of Beeching's most enduring legacies was the way that the railway's emphasis was changed from being a predominantly goods-led system to one that prioritised long distance passenger services. Although before nationalisation all four major railway companies had their crack expresses, they had to be run on a system that was bursting at the seams with conflicting goods and local passenger traffic.

Beeching foresaw that the main demand in the future would be for travel from city to city at high speeds with passengers travelling to their nearest station by bus or by car. His view was that the best way to achieve this was to clear the system of slow-speed competing traffic and to modernise the long-distance services. It was in this period that the phrase 'inter-city' was originally coined and the foundations of the main passenger services that are still in existence today were laid.

The report also identified that suburban services into large cities, such as London, were very important although they hardly covered their costs. Closing these was 'inconceivable' but the report was silent as to how they might be made more profitable, save for a suggestion that fares would have to be raised to a more realistic level. Although there was no direct action as a result of the report, the debate on this led to the principle that local authorities could make a financial contribution towards retaining a rail service. Had that principle existed in the immediate aftermath of Beeching, it might have led to more lines being retained.

It is easy to see how Beeching came to the conclusions he did given the information and tools he had to hand at the time. However, it is also interesting to note how many of his proposals were a development from what had gone before rather than of bold new thinking. The report had a massive impact on the railway system, not only with the well-known series of closures but also with the initiatives, such as Freightliner and Inter-City, that allowed the railway to survive and to develop into the system we have today.

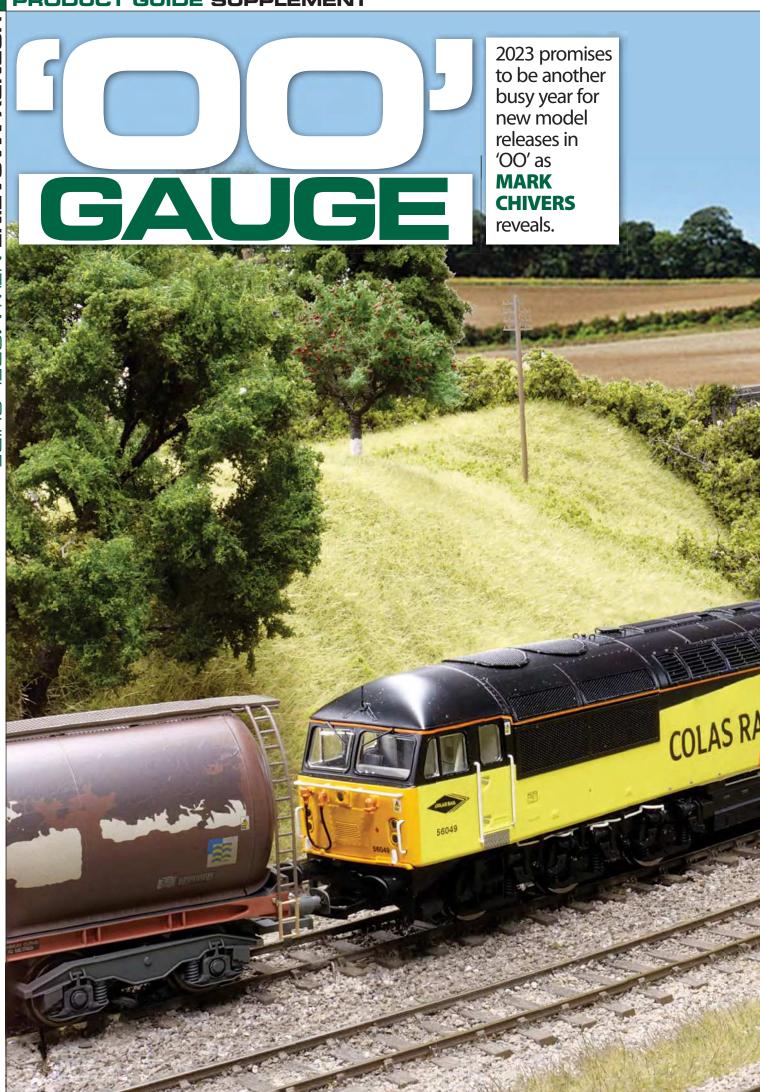
















F you thought 2022 was an outstanding year for new releases, then prepare yourself as 2023 is shaping up to be equally exciting. Despite disruptions to the supply chain which continue to affect manufacturers, there has been a steady stream of new releases over the past 12 months. Particular 'OO' gauge highlights included Hornby's all-new BR '9F' 2-10-0, Class 91 electric and the diminutive Liverpool and Manchester Railway (L&MR) Lion 0-4-2, Rails of Sheffield's North Eastern Railway autocar and 'ES1' electric, Dapol's Class 59 diesel and Accurascale's Class 55 diesel and Class 92 electric.

There have also been a few more models announced after the last survey which have since been released, such as Hornby's 'OO' gauge model of the L&MR's Tiger and Bachmann's all-new Class 37 diesel.

This year's survey boasts 73 locomotive and multiple unit projects and 76 rolling stock items. 52 motive power projects are slated for completion before the end of the year, while 71 of the rolling stock items are expected to appear in 2023.

Looking a little closer, 30 are steam outline locomotives while 43 are diesel, electric or bi-mode items and of the rolling stock items, 32 are carriage projects and 44 are wagons. Indeed, wagons is an area that some manufacturers have been concentrating on recently, filling some significant gaps.

Here are some of the highlights (see Table 1 and 2 for full project listings):

#### **ACCURASCALE**

Following the release of its first 'OO' gauge ready-to-run locomotives with the Class 55 diesel and Class 92 electric, Accurascale has set the bar high in terms of expectation for its next locomotive releases – and it continues to push the envelope with a series of improvements planned for the next batch of Class 55s.

Most recently, the manufacturer has announced details for its second 'OO' gauge ready-to-run steam locomotive in the Great Eastern Railway 'Buckjumpers' – LNER 'J67-J69' 0-6-0Ts.

On the horizon are the company's all-new Class 37 diesels and its first steam outline locomotive, the Great Western Railway 'Manor' 4-6-0. The 'Manor' is on-track to arrive in the UK this spring with 11 models set to appear, including Key Publishing's exclusive 7802 Bradley Manor in BR lined green with late crests.

Accurascale's Class 37s are also expected this spring with the first batches due during April, with the Scottish 'car-headlight' fitted Class 37/0s arriving first followed by the modern version of the Class 37/4 variants. Further examples will follow into the summer.

Next, the Class 31 A1A-A1A diesels are set to appear later this summer with 16 different models being produced, reflecting the prototype's long service careers, while the eagerly-anticipated all-new Class 89 electric - a joint Accurascale and Rails of Shefield project - is also on schedule for release later this year.

Rolling stock isn't forgotten, as the company's all-new BR Mk 2b carriages are expected to be released this spring, with 22 models forming the first batch of FK, SK, BFK and TSOs. Expectation is certainly high, given the quality of the recent Mk 5 carriages from the manufacturer.

Also due this spring are the GWR Siphon G >>>

vans, which are currently in transit to the UK and should be here during April, while looking further ahead the BR Mk 1 suburban carriages and 21ton North Eastern Region hoppers are expected to appear during the summer, as are the present-day models of the FNA-D nuclear flask carriers.

#### **BACHMANN**

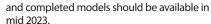
Bachmann's policy of announcing its new model plans in the quarterly British Railway Announcements has significantly reduced the backlog of outstanding projects. However, since the last edition of the New Model Guide, several new 'OO' gauge models have arrived without appearing in the listings including the all-new Class 37 diesel and South Eastern and Chatham Railway (SECR) 'Dance Hall' brake vans.

Its all-new 'OO' Class 25/1 and 25/2 Bo-Bo diesels are progressing, with release slated for the last quarter of the year, while a couple of upgraded models are nearing fruition with the BR '9F' 2-10-0 and Class 40 1Co-Co1 due during the spring. The Class 40 will bear newlytooled elements while the BR '9F' has received an upgrade to the chassis to accomodate digital sound. Also due shortly is the recently-announced MXA 'Lobster' bogie open wagon (HM190).

#### **CAVALEX MODELS**

Model Rail Scotland 2023 provided the launch pad for Cavalex Models' second 'OO' gauge locomotive – the Class 60 Co-Co diesel. The manufacturer had a 3D-printed model of the locomotive on its stand for viewing, while the project is currently in tooling. It boasts a five-pole motor, twin flywheels, low ratio gearbox, 21-pin DCC decoder socket and onboard power bank amongst the specification. Ten models are planned initially.

The company's all-new Class 56 is also progressing well, with 14 standard models and a pair of GBRf 'Railtour' limited edition examples planned. Decorated samples have been assessed



Cavalex Models' newly-tooled 'OO' PHA/JGA bogie aggregate hoppers and PHA/JYA bogie aggregate open box wagons should then follow. Decorated samples of the PHA/JGA have been received for assessment, while the PHA/JYAs have progressed to the Engineering Prototype stage. Both projects are slated for release by the end of 2023.

## **DAPOL**

Having delivered its 'OO' gauge Class 59 Co-Co diesel in late 2022, Dapol has several projects for the scale remaining including GWR '43XX' 2-6-0s, the Hawthorn Leslie Industrial 0-4-0ST, GWR Toplight 'City' non-corridor coaches, 14ton Class A tanks and JHA bogie aggregate hopper wagons. As this issue closed for press Dapol also revealed plans for a new 'OO' gauge GWR Diagram N Autocoach.

# HELJAN

Several of Heljan's 'OO' gauge projects are due to be completed in the coming months with the North British diesel-electric 10800 expected to arrive with retailers during May, the eagerlyawaited Newton Chambers Car Carriers in June, retooled Class 47 Co-Co diesel in August and the Great Western Railway Parcels railcar in September.

Still in development, revised versions of the company's 'OO' LNER 'O2' 2-8-0 have progressed to the decorated sample stage, while the Class 104 Diesel Multiple Unit and Class 86/2 Bo-Bo electric are currently at the Engineering Prototype point in the process. Heljan's retooled 'OO' gauge Class 26 is also progressing with decorated samples due to arrive for assessment next. All bar the Class 86/2 (due in early 2024) are scheduled for release later this year.

## **HORNBY**

As this issue closed for press the first examples of Hornby's all-new Hornby Dublo Gresley 'A1/A3' 4-6-2 models of Flying Scotsman were arriving in the UK. First revealed as part of the Flying Scotsman centenary launch in October 2022, six models are set to appear representing the locomotive at key points in its history. As with previously-added new Hornby Dublo models, it features a die-cast body married to the existing high-fidelity chassis and tender.

Many of the projects carried over from previous announcements are also set to be released during the year with the first of the BR '2MT' 2-6-0s set to appear this spring, as are the diminutive Ruston 88DS locomotives. Hornby's all-new LNER 'P2' 2-8-2s are scheduled to appear in mid 2023, together with the new diecast bodied Hornby Dublo 'A4' 4-6-2s and revised Class 423 4-VEP Electric Multiple Units (EMU).

The LMS 'Turbomotive' 4-6-2 is scheduled for a summer release, while the LNER 'Coronation' carriages and 2022-announced GWR 'Macaw >>>

Hornby is also set to deliver two innovative new projects this year with the first of its new TXS Bluetooth digital decoders now available and its newly-developed steam generator system for selected 'OO' gauge models is also due to debut soon.

# **KERNOW MODEL RAIL CENTRE**

The long-awaited 'OO' gauge GWR steam railmotor is edging closer to release. The project is in production and these all-new models are expected to arrive with Kernow Model Rail Centre in early summer.

# **KR MODELS**

Following the recent arrival of KR Models' newly-tooled 'OO' gauge Palbrick wagon, the next all-new 'OO' gauge projects set to appear this summer will be the Clayton DHP1, Hunslet industrial 1124hp Bo-Bo diesel and British Steel Torpedo molten iron ore wagons, decorated

samples of which have been on display at recent exhibitions.

KR Models' all-new 'OO' 4-DD Electric Multiple

An EP sample of KR Models' forthcoming Haydock Foundry 0-6-0WT Bellerophon and first shots of the Bulleid 4-DD EMU have also been received by the development team for assessment.

Meanwhile, the company has just revealed that its next all-new 'OO' gauge project is the GWR Mica B refrigerated van. CAD work is complete and the project is about to enter tooling.

# **RAILS OF SHEFFIELD**

Several of the Sheffield based retailer's exclusive 'OO' gauge locomotives are set to arrive this year, with the Dapol-produced SECR 'D1' 4-4-0 edging closer and the Heljan-developed BR gas turbine 18100 and rebuilt E1000/E2001 due later this summer. Decorated samples of these latter models are currently being evaluated ahead of production.

# **RAPIDO TRAINS UK**

Recent arrivals from Rapido Trains UK include the GWR 'Iron Mink' vans and four-plank opens, together with BR 20ton VIX ferry vans.

In the pipeline, the manufacturer's all-new 'OO' gauge SECR six-wheel brake van and BR OAA open wagon are expected to arrive in late spring/early summer, while the longawaited model of the L&MR's Lion/Thunderbolt is expected to arrive during the summer. This is



expected to be accompanied by the GWR 'Loriot Y' wagon and GWR '15XX' 0-6-0PT.

New model announcements include the first 'OO' gauge ready-to-run Metropolitan Railway steam locomotive with a model of the 'E' 0-4-4T, while a series of Railway Clearing House five and seven plank private owner wagons are also planned.

# **REALTRACK MODELS**

Realtrack Models' all-new 'OO' gauge Class 142 two-car 'Pacer' DMUs are progressing well, with completed models expected to arrive in December 2023. 15 different models are planned including Provincial, BR chocolate and cream, Greater Manchester PTE orange, Mersey Rail, Regional Railways, Arriva Trains Wales, First Great Western and Northern colour schemes.

## **REVOLUTION TRAINS**

Expected soon is Revolution Trains' (RT) newly-tooled 'OO' gauge BR Southern Region General Manager's saloon in BR blue and grey, Network SouthEast and contemporary green colour schemes. Three different bodyshells are being produced to reflect the evolution of this distinctive vehicle. It is expected to arrive during April/May.

Similarly, the company's all-new FNA-D nuclear flask carrier and TUA caustic soda tank (exclusive commission for Rainbow Railways) are also due to arrive soon.

Further 'OO' wagons which are expected to arrive mid-2023 include the PCA alumina tanks and HOA bogie hopper wagons, while the KSA 'Rover' cube wagons and timber carriers are anticipated for release in late 2023. Keeping the theme, the 'Borail', 'Mullet', 'Parr' and 'Super Tench' wagons, together with the Cartic-4 car carriers are also slated for a 2023 release.

Looking further ahead, development of RT's allnew 'OO' gauge Class 18 Clayton CBD90 hybrid battery diesel shunter has also advanced to the Engineering Prototype sample stage, with release planned for 2024.

# **SUTTON'S LOCOMOTIVE WORKS**

Manufacture of Sutton's Locomotive Works' all-new 'OO' gauge Class 25/2 and 25/3 Bo-Bo diesels is back on track, following delays due to the general shortage of components. These are now expected to arrive by the middle of the year, while the new 'Highland' Class 24/1 Bo-Bo is now scheduled for a late 2023 release.

# THE MODEL CENTRE (TMC)

The wait for TMC's exclusive Bachmannproduced 'OO' gauge LNER 'G5' 0-4-4T is almost over, with release expected later this spring. Eight different locomotives are expected in NER lined green, LNER lined black, BR lined black with early crests and BR lined black with late crests, with detail variations between models incorporated into the tooling suite. Digital sound-fitted options will also be available.

## **EXCITING TIMES**

This year is set to be another remarkable one for 'OO' gauge modellers, especially if all that is promised is delivered within the suggested timeframes. Tables 1 and 2 provide a snapshot of the expected timescales and Hornby Magazine will keep you up-to-date with the latest news and reviews each month. HM

# DIMINUTIVE DEVELOPMENTS



HERE appears to be no let-up in the number of 'N' gauge models planned for the next 12 months and beyond with at least 56 projects on the go, including 27 locomotives or multiple units and 29 items of rolling stock currently in development.

Of the motive power projects, eight are steam locomotives while the remainder are diesel, electric or bi-mode. The rolling stock roster boasts ten carriage projects and 18 wagon projects. Within these, some models are variations on a theme, but there are also a

Trains Mk 5 carriages which are bundled as single projects due to their availability, although in reality they will spawn more than one vehicle type.

This year's tally is slightly up on last year's survey and in terms of the share of projects is concerned, Revolution Trains leads the way with 28 'N' gauge items in development. Dapol is next with seven projects – plus the newly announced Class 66 – followed by Rapido Trains and Graham Farish boasting six each. The N Gauge Society and Sonic Models boast two model projects in development, while Cavalex

Models and C=Rail have one apiece.

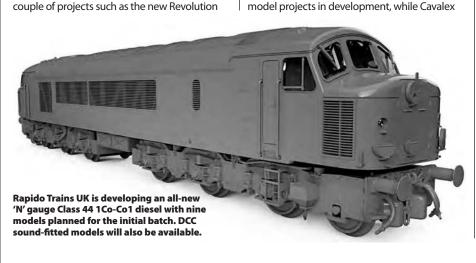
In terms of each project's status, it is still difficult to determine exactly when they will come to fruition as the world economy, supply chain and staffing issues are still having an impact on the manufacturing process. However, it is likely that 16 of the motive power projects and 14 of the rolling stock items could appear before the end of the year.

The past year has also enjoyed a steady stream of new releases including Bachmann's Graham Farish Class 319 Electric Multiple Units (EMUs) and Class 769 Bi-mode units, as well as the manufacturer's all-new Class 90 electric (HM190) and the Midland '4F' 0-6-0 with digital sound upgrade, while Rapido Trains UK delivered its first ready-to-run 'N' gauge locomotive with the Metropolitan Vickers Class 28 Co-Bo diesel, together with the associated Conflat P wagons. Revolution Trains has also delivered its long-

Revolution Trains has also delivered its longawaited 'N' gauge Drax biomass wagons in their eye-catching colour schemes, along with all-new Class A tanks, MTV and ZKV 'Zander' wagons.

# **ON THE WAY**

Further models are nearing completion with Revolution Trains expecting its Class 128 parcels railcars this spring, together with the Mk 5 Caledonian Sleeper and TransPennine Express carriage packs which should also be arriving





imminently. In terms of freight, the long-awaited PFA coal container wagons should be here this spring too, while the modern FNA-D nuclear flask carrier is expected in the summer.

The manufacturer's all-new 'N' gauge Class 59 diesel locomotive is also progressing well with release currently slated for the summer too, together with the Class 313 and 314 EMUs. Decorated samples of these impressive looking new models have been assessed by the development team, with examples planned in BR blue and grey, Network SouthEast, Silverlink, First Capital Connect and Southern for the 313s along with Strathclyde Passenger Transport Executive orange and black and the distinctive ScotRail Saltire colour scheme for the 314s.

As previously mentioned, Bachmann's policy of revealing new models as they are coming to fruition as part of its quarterly British Railway Announcements has reduced the number of projects in the survey, with a new Class 158 Diesel Multiple Unit (DMU) currently slated for a late 2023 release. The Class 450 EMU, is now expected in early 2024, while a series of model upgrades is also nearing completion with the BR '5MT' 4-6-0 (sound upgrade), Class 14 0-6-0DH (DCC and sound upgrade) and Crewe 'cut' version of the Class 47 Co-Co diesel all due before the end of 2023.

gauge projects including the Class 44 diesel, LNER Dynamometer Car and BR OAA open airbraked wagons are continuing, although no timescales are currently available for these, while Sonic Models' new 'N' gauge LNER 'J50' 0-6-0T remains on target for a mid-year release and the all-new GWR 'Large Prairie' 2-6-2T should hopefully be available by the end of the year.

Progress also continues in the background on Dapol's existing 'N' gauge projects and as this guide closed for press the manufacturer announced plans for a new Class 66. C=Rail's new FSA/FTA Freightliner wagons and Cavalex Models' all-new PGA hopper wagons are nearing completion – the latter now expected with Rails of Sheffield by the summer.

Finally, the N Gauge Society has two exclusive ready-to-run model projects in the works right now, with a series of 'N' gauge VIX ferry vans now at the decorated samples stage undergoing assessment and the Cowans and Sheldon 6.5ton and 10ton hand cranes. Ten different versions of the crane have been proposed, while 12 versions of the VIX ferry vans are planned covering examples of the various colour schemes on the prototypes through the years.

See tables 3 and 4 for the current estimated arrival times for all the existing 'N' gauge projects, which are subject to change.

# **BUSY TIMES**

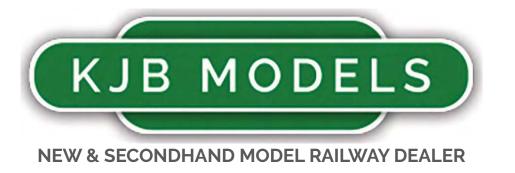

# GALGE DEVELOPMENT





HERE is something special about the feel of an 'O' gauge model, and British modellers certainly appreciate that as the range and popularity of the scale continue to grow. Perhaps it is the competitiveness in price with new 'OO' gauge models which has helped interest levels, or perhaps there is something else at play.

Whatever the reason, 'O' gauge is thriving with ever more detailed and feature-rich products in development covering a broad range of subjects from compact tank engines to main line diesels, humble goods wagons and main line coaching stock.

For the mainstream there are four big names - Dapol, Lionheart Trains, Heljan and Ellis Clark Trains - all of which produce ready-to-run

models using similar materials and techniques. In addition there are a number of high-end hand-built brass model producers including Lee Marsh Models, 55H and Masterpiece Models which create top end products at very limited quantities with a general focus on steam motive power.

# **STEAM TRACTION**

The coming year looks very exciting for steam era modellers for two reasons in particular: Ellis Clark Trains' Stanier 'Black Five' 4-6-0 and Lionheart Trains' BR '3MT' 2-6-2T. Pre-

production samples of these two locomotives are impressive to say the least, with both making extensive use of die-casting to create highly detailed models packed full of features and details.

Ellis Clark received the first decorated samples of the Stanier 'Black Five' in March 2023 with running samples expected soon ahead of

an expected 2023 release date.
Meanwhile, the Lionheart '3MT'
was shown with full decoration
– including an incredible cab
interior – at the Warley National
Model Railway Exhibition in

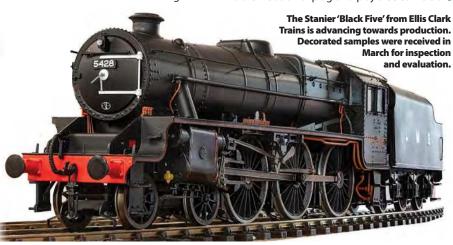
November 2022.

However, there are many other steam locomotives to look forward to including the

LSWR Adams 'B4' 0-4-0T and Hunslet 'Austerity' 0-6-0ST from Dapol, while finescale brass manufacturer 55H was expected to take delivery of a production sample of its new BR '4MT' 4-6-0 as this issue of *Hornby Magazine* closed for press. Looking further afield, Lee Marsh Models began deliveries of its new GWR 'Castle' 4-6-0 in early 2023 which will be followed by its GWR '850' 0-6-0ST later this year. The BR '4MT' 2-6-4T is set to be the next production for Lee Marsh.

# **DIESEL POWER**

Heljan remains the dominant force in ready-torun 'O' gauge diesel traction with an extensive list of new products and redevelopments in progress. A positive step from the manufacturer is the inclusion of plug-and-play DCC conversion

deliver detail to a level above what is possible in '00' gauge. This is the Lionheart Trains BR '3MT' 2-6-2T.

new LokSound L decoder interface which removes the need for hard wiring a decoder using screw terminals.

First on the list from Heljan this year are its long-awaited models of the Class 117, 121 and 122 Diesel Multiple Unit (DMU) family. These products have been a long time coming, but like many we are eager to see the finished products in their choice of BR green, blue and grey and Network

SouthEast colours. They are due in Spring 2023.

The next release from Heljan after the DMUs is expected to be the Class 58 Co-Co which was announced at the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition in November 2022 while the Class 73 electro-diesel is expected in the autumn. The Class 73 promises to be one of Heljan's best yet based on what we have seen so far in the engineering samples and it will model the 'JB' Class 73/1 sub-class.

Also in development for release across winter 2023 and early 2024 are models of the Class 37/0 with cutaway buffer beams, the Yorkshire Engine Company Class 02, Class 45 with sealed beam nose-end, revised Class 55 and more.

In addition Dapol is working on the other big diesel project – its model of the Class 66 for 'O' gauge. In March the manufacturer stated that the Class 66 is currently being revised with new team members working on its development.

# **ROLLING STOCK**

The choice of rolling stock, like locomotives, continues to expand for 'O' gauge with Dapol, Ellis Clark Trains, Flangeway, Greenwood and Pring, Heljan and Minerva Model Railways all developing new products.

Dapol is continuing its freight stock programme with models of the GWR 'Toad' brake van as well as LMS and GWR 12ton box

vans all in development for release during 2023. In addition, Dapol has selected two modern wagon designs for development covering the TTA 45ton tanker and the HIA bogie aggregate hopper to go with its Class 66 while the manufacturer has also created revised versions of its HAA hopper wagon with canopies for release in 2023.

from Heljan is due for release in winter 2023.

Buoyed by the success of its Presflo cement hopper in 2022, Ellis Clark Trains is working on models of the 'Seacow' and 'Sealion' bogie ballast hoppers as well as the 'Shark' ballast plough while Flangeway Models has chosen to upscale two of its 'OO' gauge products to 7mm scale covering the ZZA independent snowplough and the ZJV 'Mermaid' ballast tippler.

On the passenger front, 2023 is set to see Heljan's BR Mk 2a collection arrive in the shops together with its LMS 50ft inspection saloon for the scale while 2024 will see Greenwood and Pring release its new Southern Region Bulleid corridor coaches and Ellis Clark Trains deliver its Pullman K Type coaches for the scale.

With so many exciting projects in development the interest in 'O' gauge is bound to increase, particularly with the advent of new main line steam locomotive models from Ellis Clark and Lionheart trains. The tables with this feature outline the full list of incoming products for 'O' gauge and you can keep up to date with the latest 7mm scale news through Hornby Magazine and online at www.keymodelworld.com/o-gauge.

reveals what's coming up in the next year.

PPEARING in the New Model Guide for the first time, 'TT:120' scale officially launched in June 2022 when Peco revealed details of a series of new buildings and track for the scale. This new development for the hobby offered a more refined and true scale, which prompted Heljan and Gaugemaster to follow with announcements of new products including a Class 31 diesel from Heljan (since withdrawn) and a selection of accessories to complement the already-announced buildings from Gaugemaster. The retailer also suggested that it might consider introducing a ready-to-run Class 66 for the scale.

In October, Hornby revealed that it too was planning to enter the 'TT:120' scale market and rather than introduce a couple of items to test the water, the manufacturer launched an entire range of products including locomotives, rolling stock, buildings, track and accessories - in fact, all you need to start building an entire model railway in the new scale.

# **MOTIVE POWER**

Currently 16 locomotive projects and 34 carriage and wagon projects are in development. Of

Newly-tooled 'TT:120' scale 21ton mineral wagons are also in development, as showcased by these Engineering Prototype samples. Two models will appear initially in BR bauxite and BR grey. Release is expected

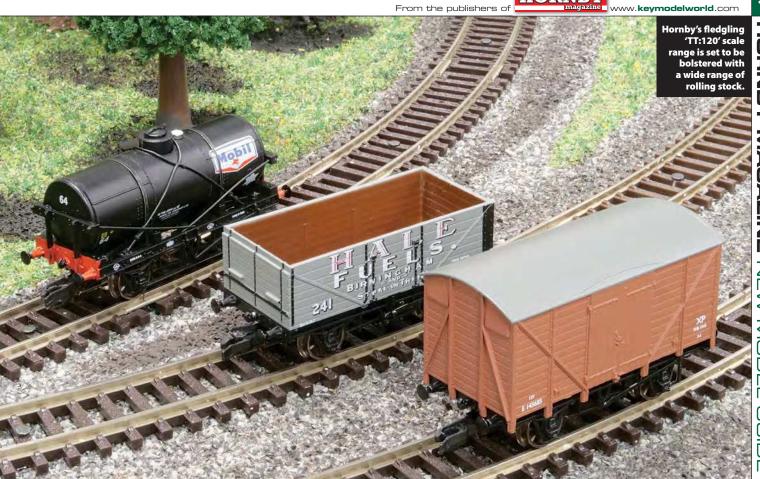


these, six of the locomotives are steam projects and ten are diesels or bi-modes. Of the 34 rolling stock projects, 18 are carriages and 16 are wagons which will very quickly enable authentic 'TT:120' scale trains to be formed. Given that the LNER and GWR carriage projects have yet to be confirmed, initial information has been included until the full extent of the plans are revealed.

By January 2023 the first of the new 'TT:120' scale train sets began to appear in the form of the Scotsman and Easterner packs, each containing a newly-tooled LNER 'A3' 4-6-2 and 'A4' 4-6-2 respectively. The former also included three all-new 'TT:120' scale Pullman cars, while the latter featured three brand new Mk 1 carriages. Pre-sales proved so popular that the sets sold through very quickly and more stock is planned for later this year. Two further 'A3' 4-6-2s, an 'A1' and three 'A4s' are also available

The new range of products is set to appear in a series of phases over the next few years, but the release schedule is phenomenal with an extensive collection of models planned. This year is set to see the addition of all-new Class 08 diesel shunters this spring in BR blue, DB red and Harry Needle Rail/GB Railfreight colours, together with Class 43 High Speed Train power cars later in the autumn, together with Mk 3 carriages to accompany them during the summer and autumn, in GWR green, InterCity and BR blue and grey colour schemes.

The next phase is set to feature Stanier 'Princess Coronation' 4-6-2s, BR Class 50 diesels and Class 66 diesels (all currently scheduled for late 2024/early 2025), while phase three should see a GWR 'Castle' 4-6-0 and BR '9F' 2-10-0 follow, together with BR Class 31s, 37s, 47s and 60s. Beyond that, the fourth phase of releases is expected to include a GWR '57XX' 0-6-0PT,



Hunslet 'J94' 0-6-0ST, LMS 'Black Five' 4-6-0 and BR 'Britannia' 4-6-2, together with Class 67 diesels and Class 73 electro-diesels, plus Class 800 InterCity Express Trains.

# **ROLLING STOCK**

As previously mentioned, the first 'TT:120' scale carriages are available now with BR Mk 1 Corridor Composite and Brake Corridor Second vehicles along with a Pullman Brake Third Parlour and Kitchen First. These are set to be joined by Stanier 57ft corridor stock and 50ft BGs in BR carmine and cream this summer and LMS crimson during the autumn. BR Mk 2e and 2f air-conditioned coaches are expected to be released in late 2023/early 2024. Liveries include BR blue and grey and InterCity schemes. Also planned for the future are LNER Gresley Corridor Composite and Brake Third coaches, GWR Collett bow-end Brake Third and Composite carriages and more BR Mk 1s including Corridor Second and Full Brake (BG) examples.

and Full Brake (BG) examples.

An influx of all-new 'TT:120' scale wagons is expected during the spring with seven-plank open private owner wagons, 12ton ventilated vans, 12ton tank wagons and LNER Toad B and BR Toad E brake vans all due to arrive. These will be followed by newly-tooled 21ton mineral wagons and HAA merry-go-round coal hoppers during the summer and all-new TTA tank wagons this autumn. Further phases of wagons are expected to include CDA china clay hoppers and MHA wagons (a natural progression of the HAA design), BR Conflat wagons, a BR Mk 1 horsebox, VEA box vans, KFA container flats, VGA box vans and YGB 'Seacow' bogie ballast hoppers.

Factor in the new 'TT:120' scale buildings, track and accessories that have also been developed, there are exciting times ahead for the fledgling scale and there are sure to be further

# NARROW GAUGE



The world of narrow gauge modelling has expanded rapidly over the past 18 months with the arrival of significant locomotive models from Bachmann and Peco. **MIKE WILD** surveys the new models planned for the future.

HEN BACHMANN RELEASED its first 'OO9' narrow gauge ready-to-run model of the Baldwin 10-12-D 4-6-OT in 2018, I don't think anyone could have imagined how popular narrow gauge modelling would become, and particularly since 2021's arrival of the Double Fairlie 0-4-4-OT from the same manufacturer. 2022 and 2023 have seen progressive release of new locomotive models including the Small England 0-4-0STT from the joint venture between Peco and Kato, the Mainline and

Quarry Hunslet 0-4-0STs from Bachmann while the Mainline Hunslet has subsequently been offered in 0-4-0STT format modelling *Linda* as it was in the mid-1960s prior to modification as a 2-4-0STT.

There have been new rolling stock arrivals for 'OO9' in 2023 with the release of the Royal Naval Armament Depot wagons (HM189), which combined with the locomotive releases has reduced the list of outstanding new items of this area of narrow gauge modelling to just four.

Top of the list is the Bachmann Narrow Gauge Baguley-Drewry 4wDM which is now scheduled for release in early

2024. The first engineering samples were shown on the Bachmann stand at the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition in November 2022 offering a glimpse of the impressive detailing and weight which has been packed into this compact

locomotive.

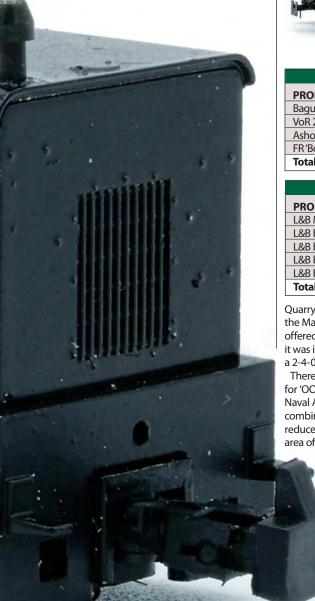

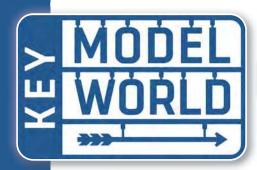

This exciting development gives a new choice of larger scale narrow gauge layouts and by the end of 2022 the new Lionheart Trains products had reached the decorated sample stage. Release is expected during 2023.

The increase in narrow gauge ready-to-run products has been a catalyst for many to make the leap and model railways which are, quite often, holiday favourites. **HM**

Originally built to carry 250t of molten Iron at a temperature of 1480° C, and still in use to this day. These wagons can often be seen from the Scunthorpe Steelworks rail tours with the Appleby Frodingham Railway Preservation Society.
