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

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ADIFFERENT APPROACH

S I WRITE this editorial the heatwave has broken and my thoughts are turning to how I might be able to fit some modelling in when there's other things at home that need doing as well.

Inevitably, faced with family commitments and so on there isn't always as much time as I'd like for my personal – as opposed to Hornby Magazine – projects. The days when I always seemed to have a rolling stock kit on the go, as well as a few buildings and perhaps some wagons for detailing seem to be well and truly in the past for the moment.

It really struck home when I sat down and really examined the contents of my toolbox. It doesn't need huge numbers of paint pots anymore, even though it is more than full of them. What it actually needs is the maximum number of jeweller's screwdrivers possible, a sharp knife, a pot of superglue, a selection of brushes and three or four weathering colours, and that's it.

As time becomes more scarce I'm probably typical of many modellers today in that I'm

more prepared to wait for a manufacturer to produce what I want than to go out and spend the time building it... after all, it's less risky than spending precious hours on a kit that might go wrong. Isn't it?

Yes, of course, times and circumstances change and it isn't necessarily a bad thing that my tastes in model projects have altered. It shows the strengths of ready-to-run, but also its weaknesses - unless we do something about it ourselves. The mass produced locomotives, rolling stock, buildings, road vehicles, trees, bushes, grasses and shrubs to might be taking some of the creativity away from railway modelling, but they don't have to. What I need to do is see beyond the stack of boxes and see the potential of what lies inside. For example, I've long had in mind to repaint a Hornby RailRoad 'D49' 4-4-0 into BR livery and add a little extra detail to it. I've got plenty of road vehicles which need a simple coat of matt varnish adding to them to soften their appearance, and there are plenty of other readymade models which will all benefit from a bit of work. Thinking that all

through, I've no excuse for my workbench not being busier than ever!

This is really why we launched the Quick Fix feature series from HM73 – to show that a few minutes' effort can make a big difference to off-the-shelf models, especially when time is short. And the wonderful thing about these I5-minute projects is that anyone, no matter what their skill level or how much time they have, can really crack on and do a very decent job.

So, if you have 15 minutes, break out the tools and do one of those little jobs you've been meaning to for a while... it made a difference to the way I approach my workbench, and hopefully it'll do the same for you too.

Happy modelling!

BACHMANN LATEST '600' GAUGE

T ITS annual open day in July Bachmann showcased the latest pre-production samples of new models planned for release during 2013.

Highlights included the latest samples of the Robinson 'JII' 0-6-0, Midland 'IF' 0-6-0T (both open and closed cab variants), the LYR 2-4-2T, LMS '4F' 0-6-0 and 'Dukedog' 4-4-0.

First on the cards is the Midland '4F' 0-6-0 which is due to arrive in the UK during August and September. It will be available in

LMS and BR liveries with prices starting from £89.95.

The 'JII' 0-6-0 is now expected to be released in December/January and it will be available in three liveries covering LNER and BR black schemes. All versions will feature a 21-pin DCC decoder socket and prices will start from £89.95 for a DCC ready 'JII'.

The LYR 2-4-2T is due out progressively through November-January and will be available in LMS black and BR lined black liveries. Prices will start from £83.95 for the pristine DCC ready versions.

The 'Dukedog' 4-4-0 (HM74) has now moved back to December/January for release while the Midland '1F' 0-6-0T is expected to be released in 2014.

For diesel traction modellers new samples of Bachmann's model of 10000/10001, due October/November this year, and variants of the Metro Cammell Class 101 DMU were on show together with pre-production livery samples of items including the Class 85 with small yellow warning panels.

The long awaited retooled Class 40 is expected in September/October.



New production run for NRM Deltic

The National Collection in Miniature series is set to expand with a new version of the highly popular *Deltic* in its BR service livery which it carried while in traffic on the Eastern Region of BR. Release is expected during August.

The model has previously been released in its preserved colour scheme and the new version will be available DCC ready, DCC fitted, DCC sound fitted and DCC ready weathered. The main portion of the production run will concentrate on the DCC ready version with limited numbers of the latter three options.

The price for the DCC ready

version is £125 with the DCC fitted or weathered model costing £135 and the DCC sound fitted version priced at £250.

Bachmann is to release five new Digital Command Control (DCC) sound fitted locomotives featuring a new 'economy' sound package produced by American sound manufacturer Soundtraxx.

The sound decoders will use conventional 21-pin decoder sockets, but utilise

new technology. The decoders will feature a limited number of functions and cannot be overwritten with new sounds.

Bachmann European Sales and Marketing Manager David Haarhaus says: "We are delighted to introduce a new quality sound system which has all the benefits of earlier systems, but is now more economical to produce. We can now pass those savings on to our customers."

The new decoders will operate with both DCC and analogue control systems, although with the latter functionality will be reduced to just locomotive running sounds.

Models planned for release include the GWR '57XX' 0-6-0T, GWR '4575' 2-6-2T and BR 'Standard Five' 4-6-0 from the steam range and the Class 20 and 37 for diesel followers. Prices will range from £132 for the '57XX' to £181 for a 'Standard Five'.





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
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ITHIN OUR GROUP hut are located our two main 4mm finescale 'OO' gauge layouts, Tamerig Central, the main section of which is nearly 45 years old, and the now virtually complete Bath Green Park, our main project for the past 15 years.

Tamerig was originally built to be portable, but was retired to help safeguard it from the ravages of time and is now permanently fixed, having been replaced by 'Green Park' on the exhibition circuit. The name Tamerig derives from our group initials, TMRG.

Because both layouts are based on former Midland Railway practice, linking them together to provide a coherent system provides a much longer run than either could provide on their own and massive operating potential. To achieve this, both layouts are wired on the cab control principle, whereby each main control panel can operate train movements over most of the layout. There are other panel section switches set to the panel taking control once the points for that area have been set and signals cleared. This system allows parallel moves to be operated. The principle is always followed that operators work trains towards their panel. For example the 'Green Park' operator can drive an incoming train into the station Platform 2 while another operator drives a departing movement simultaneously from Platform I.

Between the two layouts there are five main control panels and three subsidiaries. Bath Green Park has main panels for the station itself, the engine sheds and Bath Junction,

At 'home' Bath Green Park is one part of a much larger model which includes Tamerig Central – a substantial continuous run main line layout. with sub-panels for the Midland yard and Somerset & Dorset (S&D) yard areas. Tamerig, meanwhile, has main panels to operate the Midland trains to/from 'Green Park' and the clockwise circuit, the other to operate the S&D trains to/from 'Green Park' and the anticlockwise circuit, together with a sub-panel for the canal sidings which also controls Tamerig engine shed and station yard areas.

This creates a busy operating requirement, with a minimum need for five operators if a full service is to be run between the two layouts. Tamerig can be run as a stand-alone layout by just two operators. 'Green Park' can only be

run at present in conjunction with Tamerig when it's not being exhibited, a situation we are examining with the aim of enabling Green Park to be operated independently.

Home and awayTo display Bath Green Park to best effect it was necessary to build two versions, with each using the four main boards on which the station, Midland and S&D engine sheds, and the Midland yard are built. The 'away' version comprises 12 boards in total, with seven (including the main four) creating the 56ft long public frontage to which are joined further

boards to provide a return transit yard circuit to permit out and back operation to/from 'Green Park' station without reversal.

When on 'away' duty it requires eight operators working in alternate shifts of four at a time. The board modules were designed to fit a standard 7.5ton tail lift vehicle using a series of wheeled structures to move them between our hut and the vehicle and then to exhibition venues. It can be erected with trial trains running in under two hours but it takes a further hour or so to get the stock in place and dress the stand with overhead lighting gantries, display boards and the like.





At the station end of the layout we usually include a small table for visitor enquires to limit operator distraction from spectators, who are often standing three or four deep along the layout frontage throughout exhibition opening hours.

The 'home' version uses the four main boards with one portable and another large fixed section to join it to Tamerig. This was required to enable 'Green Park' to be accommodated within our building. It became a major challenge to squeeze it all in and yet still leave a decent circulating area for visitors. We are very fortunate to have the West Somerset Railway (our landlord) immediately outside our door to provide an authentic background with the authentic sounds, sights and smells of an operational steam railway. Our building is located on Platform I at Bishops Lydeard station. We open to the public on most WSR special event days with full operation, plus six Wednesdays during the school Summer holidays when we open for visitor viewing only with maybe a very limited operation.

Behind the scenes

The heart of the combined layout operations in our home premises is the extensive fiddle yard complex located behind the Tamerig layout. This provides three four-track yards and one five-track yard for Tamerig, plus two long storage sidings each able to hold up to





five trains. One each of the latter is allocated for the Midland and S&D circuits to permit out and back operation to/from Bath Green Park without reversal.


To operate a full timetable requires 27 trains plus two extra locomotives and back-up spares to offer further variety as required. The total working capacity between both layouts equates to about 35 trains to leave enough


spare siding availability to retain operating flexibility.

Tamerig engine shed can stable up to 15 locomotives to retain operating flexibility, while 'Green Park' can accommodate up to 20 in the Midland shed and a further 12 in the S&D shed. Originally the S&D shed could stable another dozen or so within the shed building but this was found to be superfluous and the tracks

were shortened, there being little purpose in having locomotives hidden from public view and which were not required to operate the timetable. All our stock is fitted with Kadee knuckle couplers which have proved to be very reliable.

Variety of trains

Very little rolling stock is owned by the group, nearly all being provided by individual members and removed after each operating session. This offers additional variety between each session as members rotate their stock. One feature we have successfully developed is to provide stock that reflects the main theme of the special event being operated by the West Somerset Railway (WSR), so if, for example, it is a primarily diesel event we aim to operate mainly, but not exclusively, diesel hauled trains, or if a particular guest steam locomotive is operating, we try to include a model version of it in the formations. It appeals to younger visitors in particular and amuses the older ones as well, so everybody is happy!

We aim to operate both layouts to reflect prototypical practice, with correct train

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formations and operating speeds. For the WSR Winter special event held each year just after Christmas, the normal rules are relaxed to provide a wider variety of interest, such as Thomas the Tank Engine or a powered platelayer's trolley with the two figures energetically 'pumping' it along. Even a Union Pacific 'HO' scale 'Big Boy' 4-8-8-4 has been seen hauling a long rake of wagons. Such activities reflect the seasonal ambience and enable members to run rolling stock items not usually displayed. As a prominent sign exhibited in the hut reminds us, railway modelling is fun and it is good to always remember that this is what our hobby should be all about.

Operating the layouts

Tamerig offers continuous circular operation with four main running lines, the two inside ones worked automatically, the two outside ones controlled manually, with a separate fiddle yard supplying each track.

As initially built the layout facilities were less than this to offer a simpler operation but the layout has been progressively updated and expanded in stages into the form in existence today. It is a freelance design inspired by mainly former London Midland & Scottish (LMS) and London and North Eastern Railway (LNER) practice, which reflected the main interests of the earlier membership who built it. In addition to the four fiddle yards hidden from public view there is a six-track yard in front of the layout, named Canal Sidings after the canal that meanders along the frontage at one end of it. The engine shed with remotely controlled working turntable and goods yard with paved tracks are prominent features, together with the gantry mounted signalbox based on Chester No. 6 'box.

Building the 'Green Park' model created the problem of where to locate a fiddle yard to service it. After much debate the answer that eventually emerged proved to be both original and scenically very attractive. The prototype S&D layout of Bath Green Park station required two routes to be built to replicate the lines at Bath Junction to Midford, for the former S&D double into single track main line South towards Bournemouth, the former Midland Railway route to Mangotsfield and for the former Midland Railway double track main line North


towards the Midlands. This dictated the need to provide two separate return loops within the Tamerig model as insufficient space was available to provide these independently.

The solution was to build a long viaduct spanning the existing four running tracks and throat of the canal sidings to then drop down to normal baseboard level before disappearing out of sight behind Tamerig Central Station to become the S&D holding siding before returning behind the scenery to re-emerge back on the single into double track layout just before Bath Junction signalbox.


The double track Midland route disappears into a tunnel with the outward track from Bath Green Park being routed to the rear of the Tamerig fiddle yards to emerge into Tamerig Central, becoming a fifth running line along the front of the layout before re-entering the tunnel to emerge as the inward track to pass via Bath Junction and rejoin the S&D tracks back to 'Green Park' station.

At scale running speeds on the 'home' layout the full out and back journey time can take up to eight minutes depending upon the prototype working.

Tamerig's final call

Age is beginning to affect Tamerig with the baseboards in particular starting to deteriorate. It can still be reliably operated but within the next decade we expect to be faced with having to retire this very well used and long serving layout.

With the careful operation and attention regularly lavished upon it, it is difficult to appreciate how old it is or that it was once regularly erected and dismantled for exhibition display. We are currently building our next model which is of our home station, Bishops Lydeard, again to 4mm fine scale standards. This is being built to visit the smaller exhibition venues that cannot accept the much larger Bath Green Park. It is also very convenient to measure the prototype outside our door as we progress its construction.

We were delighted to achieve the top award at the Warley National Model Railway

exhibition last year, the prestigious Bachmann Shield for Bath Green Park - it put the icing on the cake to celebrate the 15 years it has taken to create it. This layout will appear at the *Hornby Magazine* Great Electric Train Show at Gaydon on October 12-13 and is already booked to appear at the 2014 Aylesbury Show.

We are a small group with commitments inevitably varying depending on members' work and family commitments. We like to think we are a happy crowd and aim to confirm the truth of this as we enjoy ourselves creating and then operating our layouts. We welcome private viewings by prior arrangement. On Monday and Thursday evenings from 7:30pm onwards we have our regular working meetings in the hut to which casual visitors are very welcome to call in for a chat.






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


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ISTORY, it seems to me, is all about the consequences of one bad decision after another – especially where taxpayer's money is involved. Railway history is littered with classic blunders and one of the choicest was British Railways' decision in 1960 to build a group of Paxman-engined 650hp diesel-hydraulic locomotives for trip freight and shunting work on the Western Region, especially in South Wales.

They were larger, faster and more powerful than the familiar Class 08s, which were designed purely for shunting. Although the first of the new Swindon-built Type Is entered traffic in July 1964, wagonload traffic was already vanishing fast. The huge marshalling yards built to handle it were never worked to capacity and management's attention had turned to long-distance bulk hauls and container traffic. The South Wales coal industry, meanwhile, had entered one of its periodic declines and the vast fleet of Class 37s at Landore and Canton was being dispersed around the country.

There would always be work for the '37s' but not for hydraulic transmission 0-6-0s with their 40mph maximum speed. Even

so, deliveries from Swindon continued to pile up until October 1965 – many of the locomotives, like the even larger numbers of '94XX' 0-6-0PTs ordered more than a decade before, effectively being redundant from the start

The consequence of another short-term decision by the British Transport Commission was that the Western Region now had 56 extremely capable locomotives on its hands with very few miles on the clock and no immediate prospect of employment. Despite being barely two years old, many were placed in store and in desperation 33 of them were sent to Hull Dairycoates, which had no experience of hydraulic traction and where they did little useful work.

In the end they were offered at knockdown prices to industry – especially the steel and coal sectors – which knew better than to look such a gift horse in the mouth.

Industrial service

While eight of these engines were sold for scrap in April 1968 – D9501/D9506/D9522/D9546 had been cut up even before steam finished on BR – a total of 48 locomotives passed to new owners, especially the state-

owned National Coal Board (NCB) and British Steel Corporation (BSC).

They were big engines by industrial standards but there was plenty of work for them. The NCB bought some for spares, which never again worked for a living (as a rule of thumb, these were the ones that retained their BR numbers in NCB ownership). Out of the serviceable engines, 19 eventually passed into preservation – one of the most numerous and useful classes of ex-BR locomotives now in private hands.

Enthusiasts know these locomotives as 'Teddy Bears' but they were always called 'Paxmans' by those who worked on them at the NCB's huge Ashington complex, at BSC's Corby works and on the deliciously rural ironstone lines of the East Midlands. A handful of the industrial engines received repaints but the vast majority retained their two-tone green livery and as far as I can tell, were never cleaned at any stage of their lives,

either with BR or in industry. This makes them ideal subjects for weathering and that is exactly what we will look at here.

STEP -BY-STEP



STEP BY STEP WEATHERING A BR CLASS 14 IN 'OO' SCALE



The Hattons/Heljan Class I4 is a handsome model with considerable refinement of detail. Unfortunately it has extraordinary amounts of play on the driving wheels, leading to a waddling gait when in motion. I cured this by cutting four Imm thick Peco fibre washers into a horseshoe shape and then slipping them between the outer pairs of wheels and the frames. This eliminates sideplay at either end while leaving plenty of clearance on the centre axle and dummy jackshaft drive. I then gave the locomotive a couple of hours' running in at gradually increasing speeds on a rolling road.

Once I was satisfied with the running I began the weathering process by spraying a thin coat of Lifecolor 'Frame Dirt' (UA 719) over the whole area beneath the running plate. I used a Paasche VLI airbrush — a good design for general-purpose use.



As soon as possible after you've finished spraying the chassis area you need to give the wheels a good clean. I use only a minimal quantity of paint when weathering, but it's still sufficient to interrupt current supply. My preference is to use cotton buds dipped in neat isopropyl alcohol.



Now the superstructure can be given a patchy coat of weathering, using a 60:40 mixture of Humbrol 'Matt Leather' (62) and Revell 'Anthracite' (8). Plenty of green still shows through. Be careful to keep the spray away from the cab windows.

bottom of the bonnet doors.



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weathering on to the walkways. This part of a locomotive is always filthy, whether steam

or diesel. I used a darker Leather/Anthracite mix here.



This was followed by an equally modest tint of 'Brake Dust' (UA 724) over the brake blocks and surrounding areas. Inverting the model in a foam cradle makes it easier to get the paint where it needs to go.



Switching to the altogether more refined Iwata HP-SB Plus, I sprayed the wheel centres and jackshaft with Metalcote 'Gunmetal' (27004) which gives an excellent representation of caked-on oil. A quality airbrush like this Iwata allows me to get really close to the work with minimal overspray.



Crewmen's arms and shoulders brush against cab doors and the surrounding areas, gradually rubbing the real-life weathering off. I replicate this effect by stroking the paint away with a No 3 brush soaked in thinners, allowing it to collect in corners.



You get a similar effect when fitters' overalls rub on the bodyside doors during maintenance on shed. Tickle away at the paint until it looks convincing — here I've only just started taking paint off.



Humbrol Metalcote 'Gunmetal' gives a great representation of sooty exhaust. Neat matt black would be overscale.



I'm using a brush lightly moistened with thinners to remove weathering from the metallic-finish handrails that were a distinctive feature of the Paxmans. Some dirt is allowed to collect in out-of-the-way places.

Brushing on a little MIG 'Industrial City Dirt' powder (P039) adds a little tonal variety to the running plates. I've wiped the handrails clean, the way they are on the prototype.

Many of the NCB 'Paxmans' were renumbered by patch-painting the cabsides in the closest available colour and then adding new lettering. I intentionally used Humbrol II4 'Russian Green' because it was not the same as the base shade. The larger the brush you use, the fewer brushstrokes you'll leave.



The lettering came from ancient Slater's wagon kits, pressed into position and reactivated with Microsol. As with the patch-painting I deliberately went for an 'artless' style in keeping with the prototype.



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Classier coaches








The supplied tension locks on the Hawksworth carriages offer a good coupling distance but this can be improved greatly by fitting the alternative close couplings supplied with each carriage.

First remove the factory fitted tension lock couplings – it may be necessary to use a pair of tweezers to release the clips from the back of the coupling pocket.

You might only have a few minutes to spare, but in just 15 minutes the exterior of carriages can be detailed and enhanced. **MIKE WILD** shows you how in 'OO' gauge.

T IS EASY TO FORGET about passenger stock and lavish all of our attention on locomotives, but the vehicles which form the trains are every bit as important.

This month our aim is to show how simple and quick it is to add a few small details and improvements to carriage formations – a project which could easily be accomplished in a coffee break!

The subject is a set of Hornby Hawksworth carriages. These superbly detailed vehicles have been available for a couple of years now and have some handy features which make them even simpler to enhance.

Each coach is supplied with optional close couplings and a pair of gangway covers; they have NEM coupling pockets, and there is a pre-drilled hole to fit a dummy coupling in the bufferbeam.

Here at Hornby Magazine we tend to

operate carriages in fixed rakes and due to the continuous run nature of the majority of our layouts, passenger sets only operate in one direction. This opens up the tail end of the train for a little detailing consisting of removal of the tension lock coupling and the addition of a gangway cover, tail lamp and a dummy screw link coupling from our spares box.

However, the biggest improvement comes in the form of close coupling these coaches. Hornby's close couplings, supplied with each coach, are a direct replacement for the fitted tension locks and they simply clip into the

NEM pockets. Once installed it reduces the gap between coaches to almost nothing and massively enhances the look of these beautifully detailed models – better still they will still negotiate second radius curves.

Naturally there are always options to take things further and, beyond the scope of this feature, we went on to weather the set of three for use on St Stephens Road – see Staff Projects. You may also want to add passengers and the panel (below) shows how to open up Hornby carriages for access to the interior...




Fitting the close couplings is very simple and takes just seconds – push them into the mounts until they clip into place.



The final result of fitting the close couplings is an impressively small distance between the gangway connections which makes a great difference to the way these carriages look on the track. Even at this proximity the Hawksworth stock will still negotiate second radius curves comfortably.

INTERIOR ACCESS



To separate the body and chassis of Hornby coaches there are between four and six plastic clips in the chassis, depending on the vehicle. Two clips are located at each end above the bogies, with the additional clips usually located in the centre. To remove the body gently prise the clips inwards until the body pulls the clip out of the chassis and repeat for each corner of the vehicle.

Industrial steam locomotives are proving popular and, as **PHIL PARKER** shows, you don't need any solder to build one of the best kits, DJH's Andrew Barclay 0-4-0ST.

HE FIRST LOCOMOTIVE KIT I
ever built was a DJH Beginners Kit
for a Class 02 diesel shunter. When
first produced in the 1990s, it was a
revelation. The chassis was largely ready made
so all the builder had to do was glue the body
together to produce a good looking model that
ran well. Mine did sterling service on layouts
for years.

That kit has since been revised and is still available, but for those looking for a suitable, and achievable, steam locomotive kit of a similar nature DJH produced a follow-up kit for an 0-4-0ST design from Andrew Barclay of Kilmarnock. The firm's products could be seen in grubby yards all over the country until the 1970s and many survive in preservation today.

Modellers have been asking for a ready-torun industrial diesel shunter for years and this year Hornby is answering that plea with a 'OO' gauge model of the Sentinel 4wDM which is due for release in September. Most would argue that they don't have the skill to build an etched kit, but what about a cast metal one?

The kit arrives packed in a large cardboard box. Inside the parts are packed in plastic so you only have to open each section as you reach that stage of the instructions. Oddly, the packing seemed a bit random with parts for different stages grouped together so I'd recommend acquiring a small box to keep unused bits in until you need them.

Several pages of instructions are included and these are good. If you separate the words from the diagrams so you can look at them simultaneously it's difficult to go too far wrong. My only criticism is that a set of notes is included that promotes soldering the parts together. Everything in the notes is correct - the author in question has built more kits than I've had hot dinners - but for a beginner, soldering this kit isn't necessary. In fact, I built it without turning a soldering iron on.

This isn't, I'll admit, a cheap project. For the same money you could buy quite a nice ready built locomotive. Some will suggest that there are cheaper kits out there to cut your teeth on. The problem is that you often get what you pay for. I had to save hard when I bought my first kit but the satisfaction of seeing it working

on a layout was huge and set me on a path that involved more complicated builds. If I'd not been able to build it, would I have carried on?

You are paying here for the design work to ensure the thing goes together. The specification is good too. Old hands will tell you that the DS10 motor supplied is too fast revving for a shunter. That's true if you only use a single stage gearbox. This little beauty has a triple stage gearbox so it will potter at shunting speeds all day.

For a beginner, the other important point is that everything is in the box. Most kits need the builder to find motor, wheels and gears. That raises the price of the finished model quite a bit. Apart from a 50p smokebox dart, I didn't add anything to the model.

So, if you decide to have a go, what are the pitfalls? The wheels. Four are supplied, two insulated and two uninsulated. If you look carefully between the rim and spokes, the insulated ones have a thin brown line. Marking these with a felt tip pen isn't a bad idea to ensure that matching types are on the same sides of the chassis. I've mixed them up in the past and I should know better.

The wheels should be attached to the axle 'quartered'. That means the crank pins are 90 degrees from each other. This needs to be

the same on each axle. Romford wheels are included which will only allow the wheel to be fitted in one of four positions on the axle. They are metal too so if you have to take a wheel off, it will go back on happily.

I tend to build the chassis before the body, although the instructions suggest working the other way around. This is personal preference as I like to get the mechanical bits completed before moving on to the rest.

Things can go wrong but it's not the end of the world. I painted the model in a 1970s style with yellow ends and a green body. This all disappeared under a coat of weathering which I was pleased with. Then I decided the finishing touch would be to clean the handrails as though the dirt had been wiped off them by enginemen's hands. Doing this, I managed to clean a bit of saddle tank as well which looked odd. Taking a deep breath, I cleaned the entire model in the same way using downward strokes. A little re-dirtying on the tank tops and the result is quite effective to my eye.

The kit is well designed and your chances of finishing it as a fully working addition to your fleet are very high. Absolutely no soldering is required. Once you've built one engine, the process can become quite addictive... well, it was for me!

STEP BY STEP BUILDING DJH'S 'OO' GAUGE ANDREW BARCLAY 0-4-0ST



Most of the kit parts are supplied packed in plastic pockets. Carefully extract them only when required so you don't lose anything.




Superglue was used for assembly. I've a couple of locomotives over a decade old stuck together with it and they haven't fallen to bits.



Sometimes the glue doesn't dry fast enough, so a can of 'kicker' is handy to speed the curing process for superglue.



Check the chassis is square then glue the brake blocks and cylinder in place and then spray it with a primer coat followed by black paint. Areas around the slots of wheel bearings should be masked off before this, although you could scrape the paint away with a sharp knife before it is fully dry if you forget.





Prepare the wheels by glueing the balance weights on. Then fit one to the axle, adding the square bearings (fat side out) and then the other wheel. Slotted nuts hold the wheels on and an etched tool is supplied to help screw these up tight if you don't have the special 'Romford' screwdriver.




STEP BY STEP BUILDING DJH'S 'OO' GAUGE ANDREW BARCLAY 0-4-0ST



Pick ups are fixed to the baseplate by a little nylon fitting that pushes through the plate and the phosphor bronze strip. They have to be bent to touch the backs of the insulated wheels and then cut to length later on.




On the top of the baseplate, the wire clips into some little pillars and is held in place with a spot of glue. If you are using tension lock couplings, now is the time to fit these too.




Carefully screw the motor into position, it's attached by two tiny screws, although being steel, they tend to stick to the motor if you drop them. Next, add the driven wheels and rotate the gears by turning the motor by hand.










Slide bars are folded up and screwed to the side of the chassis. At the front, they hook around the end of the cylinders. A tiny bit of glue is a good idea here. After this, attach all the rods noting that the pins on the back wheels are longer than those at the front.



All the boiler fitting holes needed opening out slightly with a round file but the handrail knobs slotted straight in. Put the wire through them first, glue the end one to the wire and then fit them to the tank – it's a lot easier than trying to line the things up any other way.



Handrails on the cab are moulded in so I scraped them off to be replaced with bent wire. The cab back includes odd and small spectacle plates. These were opened out with a drill to match the front as shown by the one on the right-hand side.





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How to BUILD BETTER TUNES

On the real railway tunnels are important engineering features, and for scale models they are often used to create a scenic break. **MIKE WILD** shows how you can improve your tunnels for a more realistic finish.

HROUGHOUT Britain's railway network you can find tunnels where trains disappear into the landscape. These feats of engineering were built to keep the trackbed as level as possible but were very much a last resort as their construction was very expensive.

For many years the tunnel has been a prime choice as a scenic break on a model railway, and by using simple materials and techniques a realistic tunnel can be assembled quickly for any layout.

The first railway tunnels were built in the early 1800s for tramways, and as the 19th century progressed so did the railways' ability to build tunnels. From 1830 to 1890 many feats of engineering were achieved in tunnel construction with by the far the most significant being the Severn tunnel which passed below the Severn estuary to give a direct link to South Wales. For more on the history of railway tunnels see Railway Realism in HM37.

Railway tunnels come in all shapes and sizes and there are a large number of products available to assist modellers in making these distinctive features. Tunnel mouths are available painted and unpainted from a number of sources including Bachmann, Hornby and Peco in single and double track forms.

For this project we chose one of Peco's prepainted tunnel mouths for a single track railway line, largely because it matched the stone style of other bridges on the layout it would complete. This product is well made but the plastic moulding is quite thin and flexible and really needs extra support behind it.

The main material used in building this model is polystyrene. Available from DIY stores for insulation purposes or by collecting packing materials, polystyrene is easily shaped, but the process of shaping it does create a lot of mess!





STEP BY STEP


BUILDING TUNNELS



Multiple layers of the 50mm polystyrene need to be built up so that the ground rises around the tunnel mouth and above it. To fix the blocks together instant grab adhesive has been used for a strong bond.



Having built up the layers and allowed the adhesive to set, we began carving back the blocks to create the cutting sides on the approach to the tunnel. We work on a small area at a time and blend sections together for the final result.




To further improve the tunnel's appearance the baseboard and track inside the tunnel were spray painted gloss black. A track rubber will easily clean paint of railheads, but never spray paint near a point without masking the blades first.



After painting inside the tunnel, the track outside was sprayed with Railmatch frame dirt to weather the rail sides and sleepers to match the rest of this layout.



The basic shape of the land above this tunnel now looks as we want it to. There are virtually no vertical areas and those that are close to vertical will be disguised later in the process.



To provide a final surface for grass textures the polystyrene blocks were covered with Gaugemaster plaster bandage. This was cut into 8in strips, dipped into water then pressed onto the landform.



To strengthen the Peco tunnel mouth a piece of corrugated cardboard was cut to shape around 3mm smaller than the plastic moulding. This gives the mouth more rigidity and also ensures no light bleeds through the moulding.



Behind the tunnel mouth three further pieces of corrugated card were cut to fit the tunnel opening to create what will become a 'light tight' surround to the railway as it disappears into the tunnel. All of the card components were then painted black and set aside to dry.






To give the tunnel a reason to exist it needs land above the tunnel mouth. To begin creating this a block of polystyrene was cut roughly to shape and positioned loose on top for the time being.



To give the tunnel a dark internal appearance we decided to use simple cardboard side panels. First we mocked them up with scraps from an old box to ensure the trains could pass through safely.



After completing the internal and external paintwork, the tunnel roof was repositioned and glued in place followed by a selection of off-cuts on top and in front of the upper layer. These will be used to blend the various layers together during carving.



Carving of the polystyrene blocks is a messy process – it is worth keeping a vacuum cleaner to hand and removing the debris as you go. Keep carving back the blocks until you reach your desired landform.



With two or three layers of plaster bandage on top the landform was painted dark grey to give the grass textures a dark base colour. Browns and greys are ideal colours for a base coat under scenery.



With the tunnel mouth temporarily returned into position the running line was ballasted with **Woodland Scenics** fine and medium grade blended grey ballast. This was fixed in place with PVA wood glue diluted to a 50:50 ratio with water and a drop of detergent.



To begin scenic work the landform was covered with neat PVA applied with a brush and Woodland Scenics fine blended green turf was then dusted over the top to provide a base layer of green colouring.

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TUNNEL CONSTRUCTION


STEP BY STEP BUILDING TUNNELS



With that done the tunnel mouth and internal walls were assembled together and set in place. The black painted card was fixed in place on the back of the tunnel mouth with contact adhesive for a quick and strong bond.



At the rear the black painted walls of the tunnel provide a suitable transition between the scenic and storage areas of this layout.





With the mouth set in place the first layer of static grass was applied. The bare areas either side of the wing walls will be blended in later.



After application of a second layer of static grass the hillside has good texture and depth to its grass, but it needs more work to bring it up to standard.



The final layer of grass texture is a mixture of coarse light green and burnt grass turfs from Woodland Scenics combined with the same manufacturer's fine blended green turf. This was sprinkled onto the scene then fixed in place with matt varnish from an aerosol spray can. For added highlights Woodland Scenics flowering foliage colouring was also applied sparingly onto the scene.



To really bring the tunnel mouth to life and also finally bed it into the scene (including hiding the gaps behind the wing walls) Woodland Scenics fine leaf foliage has been used. A mixture of light green and medium green pieces have been planted around the mouth adding small pieces at a time to build up the effect.



Overhanging bushes above the tunnel mouth complete this particular scene, again using Woodland Scenics fine leaf foliage.

Can families afford train sets?

Your editorial raises a very valid concern for me regarding the cost of models today.

That concern is the ability of families to buy their children a train set and develop their interest in modelling when the cost of ready-to-run models is escalating. I know that ever more accurate models are lovely but when a train is on a layout how many of us really notice all the fine detail, or add the extra stick on bits that come with it? Most of them fall off in due course anyway.

Looking at the new models for 2013 I sometimes question how big a market there is for such a wide range. A comparatively small run is obviously going to cost a lot more than a large run of simpler models. For example, how many of the 'Birdcage' coaches are Bachmann expecting to sell because at £42 they are very expensive and, as much as I would like a couple, I would not dream of paying that much.

I must admit that I often buy something to customise it. Generally second-hand models fit the bill better than brand new ones but there are exceptions: the Bachmann 'Pillbox' brake van was reasonably priced and was repainted easily and perfectly as one of the two that were at Longmoor until the railway closed in 1969.

I've been around long enough to remember that all the rich kids had Hornby Dublo train sets and the poorer ones had Tri-ang. I had the latter and I preferred the two-rail model to Hornby's three. Despite the former's often better deal, it was the cheaper manufacturer which survived.

I'm very glad that you have raised the question of cost. It has to stay reasonable to get people in to our hobby and, once in, there is no reason that a cheaper model cannot be enhanced. That is one of the joys of modelmaking.

Time for a different approach

There will obviously be two different trains of thought on this subject, both of which have their own merits. The general standard of product these days is a far cry from the 1980s and '90s, mainly due to outsourcing to China.

I personally believe that now China dominates world manufacturing, quality is beginning to suffer as they look to reduce cost and spread production into more rural areas. Controlling suppliers from a distance is always difficult and you need your own people in-country monitoring the process. I say this as a retired UK Purchasing Manager responsible for outsourcing manufacturing. Quality comes with a price, and there will be those who do not wish to see a compromise and can afford to buy a more expensive product with all the fine details.

However, the majority involved in our hobby are of an ageing population, and I would suggest, in a lot of cases, are on a fixed income.

Delicate parts are, more often than not,

easily broken, and together with eyesight not being quite as good as it was and less nimble fingers, they are difficult to fit. You mention spring loaded buffers and opening vents – are they necessary? A nice addition, but in my opinion they are not. I would rather purchase a product which runs well and looks good at a lower cost. Being a pensioner I have to think seriously about what I spend.

The economic climate, which shows no real sign of improving, leaves less to spend on the hobby. We are seeing a number of retailers going out of business and further price rises will continue to make the situation worse. It will also deter people from entering into the hobby, which is already in danger of contracting due to a number of factors, not just cost.

Hornby's design clever process looks to be a possible compromise, and it will be interesting to see how successful this becomes, providing, of course it resolves its supply chain and delivery issues.

TOO MUCH DETAIL SPOILS THE ENJOYMENT

I believe that with all the extra detail there comes a hefty price tag that few of us can afford comfortably and even if you can afford the price tag there is often a degree of hesitation and contemplation before purchase which often ruins the pleasure of the purchase.

Then when you have got your purchase home and near the layout it is with trepidation that you handle the model in case something breaks, falls off and goes missing for all eternity. Detail is definitely something we have all demanded in the past but I believe it has gone too far, that we are at risk of losing the enjoyment and pleasure that drew us to the hobby in the first place — and that with the hefty price tags we risk not attracting future generations into this all embracing and

most enjoyable hobby.

If future generations do not take up the hobby because of the cost then the major manufacturers will wither and die, just for the sake of detail. Why cannot things go back a step where modellers modelled by making their own detail from scratch rather than rely on the hands of the Chinese to do it for us?

I for one would be more than happy to have a bag of extra parts to fit to the model myself if it meant the price being kept down to a reasonable and affordable amount so that the manufacturer makes a profit (the whole point of being in business) and the modeller saves a few quid so that he/she can afford that next desired model for their railway.

GRAEME MOYES and friends rebuilt and relocated a former BR steam era model to the Waverley route and wondered what it might have been like had it remained open into the 1990s. Photography, Nigel Burkin.

ELCOME to Hazelbank quarry situated near Stow in the Scottish Borders. The layout runs under the premise that the Beeching cuts never actually claimed the Carlisle to Edinburgh 'Waverley' route. It was decided that the route was far too strategically important to lose, which along with the vast local protests against its closure, secured its survival in January 1969.

Why Hazelbank quarry? Various locations were looked into in order to match the existing structures on Crawford Bridge which was originally built by the East Kilbride Model Railway Club as a BR steam era model. Several areas were considered, including around the Stirling and Clackmannanshire area, Glasgow and South Western and Settle and Carlisle route, where semaphores still abound today with long cross-country sections in evidence. However, the only route we could find that offered us an exact match in terms of infrastructure was the long-closed Waverley

Maps were scoured and site visits made to find the perfect location on which to base our new layout. By chance, we stumbled across Hazelbank, a quarry located between Fountainhall and Stow which, in reality, could quite feasibly have served the line at this point. Very close to the site is a viaduct of a very similar size and style to the bridge on the layout, so much so in fact that it is actually quite a task to tell them apart. Our location had been found. The chance to run and create the dream, which, had it not been for Beeching's axe, could have been a reality was just too good to pass up.

There are many fans of the BR blue diesel days in the Stirling club who wanted a continuous circuit layout in order to give the extensive fleet of locomotives a decent run. Simon's Devilla Colliery and Andrew's Airthrey Park layouts were and are run at exhibitions using our Digital Command Control (DCC) sound fitted locomotives but they do not get the chance to stretch their legs to their full

capability. With end-to-end layouts the locomotives have no sooner departed with the sound being fully enjoyed by the audience than they are off scene. These types of layouts are ideally suited, in our minds, to showing the fine detailing of our locomotives off to full advantage or enjoying their sound in tickover mode but for longrunning sound quality a layout of Hazelbank's type was required.



All change at Hazelbank


The layout has undergone both a time shift and a change of locality, moving it from the West Coast Main Line in the 1960s to the Waverley route in the days when BR blue ruled the rails. The layout now runs in three different eras – 1974, 1985 and 1993.

Work began on the rebuild back in Spring 2010. Graeme, whose intention it was to complete the work more or less alone, was well on with completing the complex rewiring of the fiddle yard sections when he suffered a sudden serious illness preventing him continuing with work on the layout. In stepped his Stirling and Clackmannan Model Railway Club (S&CDMRC) colleagues James Reid, Simon Barratt and Malcolm and Andrew Donnelly.

James took over control of the DCC re-wire whilst Malcolm built the beautiful structures and buildings required for the new layout as well as a refurbishment of the scenery. Andrew and Simon have been responsible for Hazelbank's extensive fleet of mainly BR blue liveried locomotives and Diesel Multiple Units (DMUs) along with the required coaches, wagons and other rolling stock by either building them from kits or re-working off the shelf items where necessary, usually involving repainting and weathering them up to the standard you can see on the article photographs.

Since 2010, the layout has been converted from DC to full DCC control. This entailed the removal of the majority of the original analogue track wiring, followed by fitting of droppers from every length of rail, thereby removing reliance on fishplates to carry the current. Droppers were formed with 7/0.2 stranded wire and were all connected to the two bus wires formed of 1.5mm stranded cable. New DCC jumper cables were made up

to connect the baseboards, with wiring for the point motors left as originally fitted with their own inter-board connectors. The provision of insulated fishplates at all of the common crossings allowed for polarity switching through microswitches on the point motors. Point blades were also electrically connected to the relevant stock rail to eliminate short circuits from out of gauge wheelsets. A Lenz system is used to control locomotives utilising an Expressnet system allowing operators to move around the layout as required.

Scenic refresh

The scenery has received an entire refresh by Malcolm Donnelly and has undergone a massive transformation in some places. A 1960s-style ballast loading platform has been constructed and added to the yard scene in the centre of the layout. A new North British Railway (NBR) signalbox has also replaced the old Caledonian Railway example, whilst all of the semaphore signals have been converted from the lower quadrant Caledonian type to the upper quadrant versions, typical of the vast majority of traditionally signalled areas of

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THE SIGNALBOX

Hazelbank Sidings' signalbox was built in the style of the box at Woodburn, on the long-defunct Border Counties Railway. The model was built to be installed on a different layout entirely, but was donated to Hazelbank during the mid-stages of building due to its dimensional unsuitability for its intended layout. Using photographs as a guide, the basic measurements for the model were determined and from these a detailed drawing

produced. The four walls were made using 2mm thick rigid plastic. The windows and door apertures were then cut out as required before the walls were glued together around a perfectly proportioned squared off base.

The cornerstones and those that framed each of the window apertures were cut



from Imm plastic and glued into position. The face of each wall within the stonework was evenly covered

> using light grey ceramic floor tile grout mixed with a PVA adhesive. After allowing the grout to dry for 24 hours, it was then spavingly wetted with water and rubbed with a finely graded sandpaper to produce a flat surface finished flush with the faces of the Imm thick

corner stones. With the grout still in a damp condition, stone courses were scribed onto each of the walls. A dry brush technique was then used to give the stones some colour by sparingly using Humbrol paint so that it did not run into the scribed joints.

The signalbox has real glass windows. Pieces of thin glass were taken from 35mm slide mounts and glued to the interior walls across the window apertures. Using styrene strip from Evergreen, window frames and glazing bars were cut to size before being glued to the surface of the glass.

Britain in order to match the intended era.

The layout was completed literally just before the doors opened at its debut outing at the Ayr Model Railway Exhibition in September 2012. It comprises Up and Down running lines emerging into the scenic section from under road bridges at either end of the layout. The

lines have an elegant sweeping curvature to them and in the centre both have staging loops into which slower traffic can be looped.

Passenger traffic is a mixture of stopping DMUs on local Edinburgh to Carlisle services and Type 2 Sulzer-hauled passenger services, which often have to make way for the passage of locomotive-hauled express cross-country services and the occasional diverted East Coast and West Coast Main Line passenger working which is often Class 47. 'Peak' or even 'Deltic' hauled.

There is a variety of cross-border freight traffic including coal trains from the Fife and Lothian coalfields making their way to the many English coal-fired power stations.

There is a slight rising gradient to the centre of the layout on the approach to the signalbox which marks the summit, resulting in both






South and North-bound trains having to exert quite a bit of effort to reach the summit, before powering off to account for the falling gradient on the other side.

In the centre of the scenic area is the quarry, part of which is overgrown and out of use, as a result of the stone having been exhausted some years ago. Instead we imagine that the stone arriving at the crushing plant is now transferred there by conveyor belt from the imaginary 'live' area of the quarry situated off scene.

From there it is either loaded directly from the crushing plant into awaiting ballast wagons and dropped from the conveyor into road vehicles for onward transportation to road construction and building sites in the area, or stockpiled for loading later by machine from the 1960s-built loading bank.

Trains are loaded and shunted using Class 08s, 17s, 20s or a Sentinel locomotive, depending upon the era being operated at the time. They are shunted together and hauled around into the headshunt, before being pushed back into the loop in readiness for arrival of a main line locomotive.



The Hazelbank yard pilot duty normally sees a Haymarket Class 08 outbased for many weeks at a time, given the problems in moving a 15mph vacuum braked locomotive all the way from Edinburgh. Here we see 08286 taking a break by the signalbox.

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Motive power

We have an extensive fleet of locomotives and rolling stock at our disposal, giving us the ability to run in three periods. The size and scope of the layout has enabled us to run scale length trains of prototypical formation. While much of the stock is of ready-to-run origin one of the rules is that everything gets 'fiddled with'. To that end we try to keep Andrew Donnelly in the paint shop (in Lisbon!) and Simon Barratt in the detailing, renumbering and weathering department hard at work.

In terms of locomotives, the available fleet covers almost everything required for a

Scottish-based 1970s to 1990s layout, with the improved Class 40 from Bachmann, which is imminent, likely to be the last piece in the fleet jigsaw. The fleet consists of upwards of 120 locomotives and DMUs, all of which are sound fitted. Our Type 2s are Bachmann Class 24s and 25s, all of which have been much fettled with and a large number of Heljan Class 26s and 27s, including a couple of pushpull '27s'. On the Heljan Type 2s we have modified the bogie springs on the whole fleet to sit behind the line of the main bogie crossmember rather than directly 'underneath', as modelled. All of our locomotives are fitted

with Smiths screw link couplings and a full complement of brake pipes at both ends.

There are examples of most BR classes available including an extensive fleet of Bachmann Class 37s and Heljan Class 47s. We reckon that the heft and power of the Heljan Type 4s still 'does it' for us, over the offerings from the other manufacturers.

Andrew has repainted almost all of the fleet. This is not to say that proprietary paintwork is not any good these days, but once you have filled steps in the side of 37s that should not be there, or cut holes in the roofs of the Heljan 47s for the addition of Shawplan

Having been recessed in Hazelbank's Southbound loop, snowplough fitted 20179 is released back out onto the main line towards Carlisle with its rake of venerable oil tanks, forming a local trip working. The Type I is a detailed and repainted Bachmann model.

THE LOADING BANK

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The style of the loading bank featured was based very loosely on that at Carstairs on the Down side of the WCML. The overall proportions were strictly influenced by the amount of space available around the existing sidings. Dressed timber which formed the walls of the platform was screwed to the baseboard alongside the rails. Clearance and height restrictions were decided by placing a 'Clam' ballast wagon on the line adjacent to the outer and inner edges of the desired platform. The platform walls were then clad with metal siding from the Evergreen range of products. Sheets of thin paper were laid across the top of the finished walls and a brass rubbing of the outline produced. From this, an accurately shaped top deck was cut from 2mm rigid plastic card and fitted into position. Fine and medium graded ballasts in various colours were scattered and glued across the deck, with ample amounts of fresh grey coloured ballast, matching that used in the layout's yard operations simulating the many spills made by the loading machines. Two layers of redundant sleepers were laid around the perimeter of the deck to serve as a wheel-stop device during loading operations.



etched fans, for example, the best course of action is nearly always a full repaint.

We have used all the suppliers of sound decoders for the fleet but the largest proportion are from Bryan at Howes Models who has given us a lot of help and programmed some specials for us. Sound installation has, in the main, been carried out by Simon and in nearly every case, new, larger and in some cases bass reflex speakers, back boxes, liberal use of Blak-Tak and other tricks are employed to get the best out of the sounds. Here a lot of the old 'railway hands' come in helpful and we do not slavishly

follow any pattern for sound fitting - we just play about with speakers until we think that the sound is as authentic as we can possibly make it. In some cases the addition of bass helps, such as on the 'Deltics' and Class 60s for example. In others, especially the Class 20s, you can end up with the sound 'over muffled' and lose the treble so there is always a balance to be struck.

There is a large DMU fleet of classes 101/104/105/107/108/116/117/120/122/126 /128 and High Speed Trains on hand. Some are the excellent ready-to-run models from Bachmann and Hornby, whilst others are DC

Kits examples, running on Replica chassis or in the case of the Class 104, bits of Hornby, white metal and a Bachmann Class 108 chassis under the centre car.

Again, all are sound fitted and although in many cases the sound is a mélange of generic first generation DMU, with tweaks to the speakers and varying horns on the uploads, no one seems to have made any harsh comments on their authenticity. We have a full length HST set with two sound decoders from Legomanbiffo which are fiendishly clever in that the trailer car responds to throttle inputs in exactly the same way as the

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motored power car. The HST also perfectly demonstrates the fun in having a round and round layout with long running distances in order to demonstrate sound chips actually running at full chat. We have now also extended the Manchester Victoria parcels service all the way to Waverley (with plenty of owners' licence), in order to accommodate Heljan's excellent Class 128. It too has a Howes sound chip complete with sliding doors and a very raspy exhaust noise!

Carriage and wagon...

The layout's coach fleet is completely renumbered and detailed, being boxed together in authentic rakes, ready to go on the layout in consistent order. Lots of superb Bachmann Mk Is and pressure ventilated Mk 2s form the bulk of the coaching stock with a few air-conditioned Mk 2s, Mk 3 'sleepers' and HST trailers making up the balance. On the disc-braked rakes we have fitted Colin Craig's excellent brake disc etches, whilst the coaches are coupled with a variety of systems.

The Bachmann bent pipe is used on the Mk Is and Mk 2s as it is neat, keeps them close and works reliably. Three link couplings are always employed on the outer ends of the fixed rakes in order to couple up with locomotives. Likewise the parcels rakes have three links throughout in order to mix the rakes as required.

The wagon fleet could make an article in itself, but suffice to say that we have everything from a mid 1970s 40 'little brown' vacuum braked van train (where no two vans are exactly the same), to the early 1990s FNA flask wagons and a full rake of 36 HAAs. We run all of our wagons with Smiths three-link couplings or Instanters, except for a small complement of ballast and stone wagons, which run with Kadees allowing for handsfree operation on the front of the layout in the quarry yard.


New life...

Repurposed and relocated, Hazelbank betrays little of its origins while retaining the essence of what made Crawford Bridge so enjoyable to operate. So, if your current layout is getting a little tired, why not consider changing its location and period? It'll enjoy a whole new lease of life.

PHIL PARKER makes the final detail alterations before

ORNBY MAGAZINE'S Hartlepool exhibition was to be the first outing for Clayhanger Yard in its finished form. As the deadline approached, there were still a few jobs to be done before the layout could be shown to the public.

First, I made a loading platform in the front corner of the baseboard. The idea is that wagons can be left here, reducing the length of headshunt available and making life more challenging for the operators. Construction is simple enough – a cardboard box covered with brick plastic card. The only challenge was to get the height right.

Measuring from the baseboard top to the bottom of the door on a Dapol seven-plank wagon and then deducting a couple of millimetres gave a good enough result. In real life, goods would be wheeled on trolleys in and out of vehicles and a slightly low surface was better than slightly high.

Next, we needed to stop wagons at the end of the siding. While a conventional buffer-stop would be perfect, these tend to be quite long and reduce the siding length, which would potentially cause operational problems on a layout the size of Clayhanger. As the siding is already fairly short, a better plan was to copy real life industrial locations by fixing an old

to hide the hole. We fixed a piece of plastic onto the sleeper base with superglue and trimmed it to size once dry. Cutting away the insides of the rail chairs a little allows them to clip over the rails, held in place with some epoxy glue.

Finally, we needed a means of lighting the layout. You could exhibit without them but halls vary enormously in the illumination available. Also, any model railway looks better with strong lighting, so short of time, I adapted the lighting rig from one of my other layouts, Melbridge Dock.


The gantries are simple 2in square wooden gallows which now fit into wooden pockets on the back of the baseboard. Illumination comes from four spotlights bought at Ikea many years ago. On the front is a single 6mm plywood fascia board cut by the people who supplied the wood for the baseboards and lettered up quickly with self adhesive vinyl characters.

Showtime!

Those who saw us at Hartlepool will know that after all the effort, Clayhanger Yard worked fairly well but not entirely without hiccups.

The first problem is that Peco points rely on contact between the switch blade and stock rail to supply electricity to the frog. Ballasting and painting had made this a lot less reliable than it needed to be. Despite cleaning all the contact points before travel, sticking the layout in a hot van for a few hours on the motorway had undone all this work and the locomotives wouldn't make it even halfway along a turnout.

By Sunday, cleaning, scraping and spraying WD40 around had largely solved the problem but I need to do something involving switches before any future shows. Initial thoughts were to replace the manual point operation with Peco motors but after two days, we quite liked switching tracks manually so I'll have to see if a microswitch can be introduced into the system.

The point operating rods also gave us problems. To make them removable for transit, electrical block connectors are used to join them up under the board and by the end of day one, two of them had become disconnected. With the layout sat on a solid topped pasting table, reaching under and screwing them back in wasn't an option until the show closed in the evening. Chunkier connectors seemed to solve this for the moment.

With the layout sat on a pasting table, it was slightly lower than most. This left the fascia bottom at just over 6ft above the ground. With no barrier out front, some visitors took to ducking under it and then wondering why


injury to those who don't spot the woodwork. Some proper signwriting for the name would be nice too.

But, by and large the layout worked. Trains were shunted around. With practice, the threelink couplings were manageable. Fiddle yard cassettes were swapped over as required and we were able to keep up a reasonable service. Plenty of visitors came along to chat and several said they had been following this series of articles. I hope a few were inspired to have a go at their own Clayhanger in the future.

Despite the limited trackplan, it's quite fun to operate. At home, working from the front would be easy and of course you would have

a much better view of the layout. We brought in two or three wagon trains and distributed them around the sidings, taking out anything that had been sitting around for a while without any formal timetable but it's surprisingly fun nonetheless.

Final detailing has started. Dummy point levers from Wizard models were fitted in time for the show. By the goods shed is a half-built Thornycroft lorry from a white metal kit. A couple of figures have been added. One provided the best laugh of the weekend when a youngster pointed out the newspaper he is reading doesn't have any text... another job for me to fix before the next outing!





Using some leftover sleepers, we did our best to stop wagons rolling off the end of the layout. It seemed to work as they all stayed on the tracks.



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
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Golden Age Models 'O' gauge CINCIPATION CONTROLL CONT

N LAST MONTH'S EDITORIAL I talked about detail and made various suggestions for what might make the ultimate ready-to-run model. This month a spectacular new model arrived in the *Hornby Magazine* office in the shape of Golden Age Models new Bulleid 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2 for 'O' gauge.

Far from being a typical ready-to-run locomotive, these finely engineered models are some of the very best that money can buy and the manufacturer has gone to the lengths of producing both the original air-smoothed design, built between 1941 and 1949, and the rebuilt 'Merchant Navy' as produced between 1956 and 1960.

Golden Age Models produces high end readyto-run locomotives and rolling stock 'OO', 'O' and Gauge I. Its products are made in limited numbers and the specifications include features such as opening smokebox doors (with full detail inside), sprung axleboxes, oven baked paint finish, Faulhaber motor, all wheel pick-up, DCC sound, optional smoke generators and custom details such as removable headcode discs and headboards. In previous issues of Hornby Magazine we have received Golden Age Models 'OO' gauge 'Brighton Belle' EMU (HM37), 'OO' gauge Gresley 'A4' 4-6-2s (HM42) and 'O' gauge Peppercorn 'A1' and 'A2' 4-6-2s (HM56).

The models


The sheer size of an 'O' gauge model of a 'Merchant Navy' is impressive in its own right, but when it is crafted to such a high standard as Golden Age Models' products then it is something very special indeed.

Starting with the air-smoothed version, the sample supplied was finished in BR lined blue as 35003 Royal Mail. It comes with the 'Devon Belle' headboard and 'wing plates' as well as a pair of Southern Region headcode discs. All of these components have been designed so that they fit onto lamp irons and brackets, just like on the real locomotives and they are produced to the same exacting standard as the locomotives.

The air-smoothed casing of 35003 matches the profile of the real locomotives to a tee and features the early valances ahead of the cylinder blocks. The 'face' is captured perfectly with Bulleid's oval smokebox door a carbon copy of the original and fitted with an etched metal numberplate and shedplate. Also present is a neatly produced smokebox door dart together with full hinge and lamp iron detail. The smokebox door opens to reveal the modelling of the superheater header and tubeplate: it is held in the closed position by a small magnet.

Moving along the bodyshell and there is more fine detail to appreciate. Golden Age has modelled the curve of the casing





exceptionally well and it even features details such as sandbox filler doors in the sides, recessed whistle and safety valves in the roof and the row of washout plugs along the top of the firebox on each side. Etched brass nameplates are also fitted on each side which are detailed replicas of the real thing.

Below the frames the beautiful Bulleid-Firth-Brown wheels have been reproduced brilliantly together with full valve gear detail - both inside and outside the frames, this really does have valve gear to the middle cylinder! Completing the look are lavishly detailed brake rigging and brake shoes.

The cab is of the later style with wedge shaped front windows while the side windows are also glazed and detailed with wind deflectors. Between the cab and tender roofs a small leather 'curtain' has been added

which was there to protect the crew in wet weather. The cab interior is fully detailed with a full complement of fittings including reverser, regulator, gauge glasses, gauges and the oval firehole door of the prototypes. Coupled to 35003 is an original pattern tender with high sides. Like the rest of the locomotive this is fully detailed inside and out and includes a real coal load, folding cab doors, sprung buffers, lamp irons, steps and sprung axleboxes.

metal numberplates and nameplates.

The detailing on the rebuilt locomotive matches that of the air-smoothed model and features all the same high standards. However, as per the real locomotives, much more is on show with the rebuilt locomotive and Golden Age has done a superb job of modelling the linkage for the whistle, clack valve pipework, sandboxes and lubricators and the more complex Walschaerts valve gear.

The tender with 35004 also differs as it models the 'Merchant Navy' tender after it was cut down. This has been done to a very high standard and includes a real coal load and







all the same features as the original condition tender with 35003.

It should also be noted that a wide range of locomotive names are available from Golden Age in both air-smoothed and rebuilt forms, but each one is produced in limited numbers. Visit the website for a full list of available locomotives.

Performance

With models like this we want performance just as much as looks and Golden Age's 'Merchant Navys' certainly deliver that! They weigh in at just over 3kg and features a Faulhaber motor. All wheel pick-ups also assist in the performance stakes while fully sprung axles help them glide along the track

On the track these locomotives run beautifully. Speed control is excellent with each of our samples performing smoothly and quietly throughout the speed range. In fact the carriages coupled behind made more noise than the locomotives. We were unable to test the full haulage capacity of the 'Merchant Navy', but suffice to say five carriages was nothing to them!

Each model is factory fitted with DCC sound from South West Digital and the decoder produces effective noises for the prototype including a correct three-cylinder exhaust beat. The volume available is excellent and these models certainly recreate the sounds of the 'Merchant Navy' class very well.

At £2,450 each these aren't like buying a mass produced 'OO' gauge ready-to-run model, but they aren't supposed to be. Golden Age Models 'Pacifics' are intended as a unique model with calibre and class above all others. They have been designed to impress and, frankly, to make you want one... and that they do very well!

Their looks and detail are second to none and the performance of these heavyweight 'Pacifics' is outstanding. Golden Age Models deserves full credit for producing what we feel is the



The Southern Railway's 'Merchant Navy' 4-6-2 locomotives were some of the best looking steam engines ever built and amongst the most technologically advanced too - but they had some features which proved troublesome in service, as **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** relates.





URING THE 1930s the Southern Railway relentlessly pursued a policy of modernisation and invested heavily in its network of suburban and commuter railways. Where possible lines were electrified and modern, fast Electric Multiple Units were provided to work them, a policy which reaped a considerable dividend for the company's shareholders.

However, the Southern had a number of longer-distance lines, particularly those to the South West and to the South Coast which still had to be worked by steam traction, development of which had been neglected. The most modern express engines available were the 'Lord Nelson' 4-6-0s of 1926 and the superb 'Schools' 4-4-0s of 1930, neither of which matched the aspirations of a traffic department intent on running longer trains at higher speeds.

In 1937 the company's Chief Mechanical Engineer, Richard Maunsell, retired and in his place was recruited Oliver Bulleid, a man who had spent many years working with Sir Nigel Gresley at the London and North Eastern Railway (LNER). At 55 years old Bulleid was a very experienced man, having worked in several posts abroad, as well as having spent 25 years assisting Gresley where he helped design many locomotives, including the famous 'A4' class 'Pacifics' and 'P2' 2-8-2s.

Bulleid was an exceptional engineer, yet had still to produce a locomotive in his own right, and given his years it would have been expected that his first engines would be conservative in design. However when, in 1938, he was given authority to produce new locomotives for long-distance express work he decided to start from the rails up and to produce a radically different machine which incorporated much of what he had learned at the LNER and a great deal more of what he admired in up-to-date practice from overseas.

Creative thinking

An early proposal for a 2-8-2, probably based on features of the 'P2', was frowned on by the civil engineers and as a result the designer settled on a conventional 4-6-2 layout, but this was to have a number of unusual features, including the wheels themselves, the valve gear and the very high boiler pressure.

What was to become the 'Merchant Navy' class was centred round an enormous boiler which was worked at the higher than normal pressure of 280psi (the highest in conventional steam locomotives in Britain were the 250psi 'Kings' of the Great Western and 'A4s' of the LNER). This supplied steam to three cylinders, one inside the frames and two outside, and these were controlled by a unique arrangement of valve gear which was driven by chains. The wheels themselves were of the Bulleid-Firth-Brown type in which the usual spokes were replaced by bridging pieces radiating from a centre plate which supported the tyre, these were about 10% lighter than normal wheels and did not require balance weights, thus reducing hammer blow to the track

Many of the workings of the engine, including the middle connecting rod, crosshead, slide bar and crank pin, as well as the chain-driven valve gear and three sets of motion was encased in a 40-gallon oil bath which had pumps to

lift the oil and distribute it over the working parts. This part of the design was incorporated because Bulleid felt that constant lubrication in a dirt-free environment would cut down on maintenance, but unfortunately while the principle was sound the construction of the oil baths was not, and the leaks which ensued were to prove problematical.

Inside the cab were some significant advances in technology. The driver's controls were properly grouped in front of a seat on the left-hand side while all the boiler controls were grouped on the right, by the fireman's position. The firehole had its own steam cylinder which opened the doors automatically when the fireman pressed a pedal on the floor. Inspection lights and headcode lamps were electrically driven and powered by a small steam generator.

Unique appearance

While all the above was revolutionary to the engineers, the appearance of the new engines was just as striking to the public, for the whole machine was encased in a streamlined (though Bulleid described it as 'air-smoothed') casing, the profile of which was designed so that the locomotive could be cleaned in a carriage washing machine.

Even the numbering system was new, with Bulleid adopting Continental practice with the first machine being 21CI, of which the letter C designated six coupled wheels, the preceding numbers being the number of front and rear axles and the final number being the actual locomotive.

21C1 Channel Packet was completed in March 1941 and was soon joined by 21C2 Union Castle and both were officially designated as Mixed Traffic locomotives thanks to their 6ft 2in diameter driving wheels. These gave the 'Merchant Navys' a higher theoretical tractive effort over a lower speed range than most

other express designs whose driving wheels were 6ft 6in diameter or greater.

The first two locomotives were immediately placed on trial on freight work between Salisbury and Eastleigh. Both were, however, found to be in excess of the estimated weight and steps had to be taken to reduce this, which included boring holes in the frames of the first five, until a modified design was available from 21C6 onwards. Another problem was smoke dispersal which led to a number of experiments being tried, the final solution being to fit a smoke scoop ahead of the chimney and short smoke deflectors.

There was also some trouble with cracks in boiler plates due to excessive contraction and special instructions had to be issued not to allow the engines to cool down too quickly.

Modifications to cure these problems were incorporated into the second batch of ten but resulted in an increase of weight to over 94tons. These alterations included a redesign to the taper of the boiler, introduction of sanding to all coupled wheels and modifications to the valves and steam reverser. The cab was also modified so that the rear had a small glazed turned in area, matched by a similar fitment to the tender.

In service development

By 1945 all 30 of the class had been completed by which time the smoke deflectors had been extended backwards due to continuing problems with smoke drifting down the locomotive's body. A further radical change to the appearance came in 1947 when work started to amend the front of the cabs to a wedge shape, giving a greater cab area and also a larger front window for both crew members. The same year there were experiments with oil firing.

By this stage the 'Merchant Navy' class was being painted again in its original malachite

green livery, following a brief period in wartime all over black. With hostilities over the locomotives were now allocated to the crack express work they were really designed for, and in particular to Bournemouth line duties.

In service the class had proved very powerful indeed but there were problems with some of Bulleid's innovations, in particular with the oil bath, which had a tendency to leak and which made some of the maintenance tasks difficult to carry out. Problems with smoke obscuring the driver's visibility persisted and the steam reverser proved problematical.

In 1949, after nationalisation, Bulleid left for a position in Ireland. Following his departure there was an unwillingness amongst BR management to persist with the modifications which constantly seemed to be necessary to the 'Merchant Navy' and to the 'West Country' and 'Battle of Britain' 4-6-2s which were smaller versions of the first design. Thereafter the only minor alteration was to the tender sides which were cut down at the rear to allow the bags of water columns to swing across with less obstruction.

Wholesale rebuilding

The biggest change to the class came in 1956 when 35018 British India Line emerged from Eastleigh works as the first to be rebuilt by British Railways in an effort to reduce some of the more troublesome features.

In this rebuild the chain-driven valve gear and its oil bath were replaced by three sets of conventional Walschaert's gear, the steam reverser was removed, a new inside cylinder was fitted and some alterations were made to the chimney and to the superheater. The exterior of the engine was completely transformed by the removal of the airsmoothed casing and the fitting of a high running plate similar to that used on the BR standards.



This rebuild produced a much less complicated and more reliable engine and over the next four years all of the class were similarly treated. The best feature of Bulleid's design, the powerful and free-steaming boiler, was retained and in rebuilt form the 'Merchant Navy' fleet finally began to fulfill its potential.

However by this time the writing was on the wall for steam on the Southern Region and the electrification of the Chatham route to Dover reduced the available duties for the class. The first two casualties were withdrawn in February 1964 and by the following year almost half had gone with the final few being used on the Southampton and Bournemouth line until that too was electrified. Seven of the class remained until the end of steam on the Southern in 1967.

Many preserved

Eleven of the class of 30 made it into preservation, thanks to Barry Scrapyard, where a number were sent. So far only three have seen service in preservation. 35005 Canadian Pacific and 35028 Clan Line have worked on the main line while 35027 Port Line has also worked on heritage railways. The sectioned remains of 35029 Ellerman Lines have been seen by millions of people at the National Railway Museum in York. The other locomotives remain under restoration.

The 'Merchant Navy' class and their smaller cousins were an example of how steam might have been further developed had there been the political and engineering will to do so. That there were so many reliability issues with the design is hardly surprising given the number of novel features incorporated but these may well have been overcome had Bulleid remained in post or had Nationalisation not taken place. Certainly the class was an outstanding piece of design and engineering which richly merits all the attention it has traditionally received.

These new weathered limited editions are exclusive to KMRC and use the outstanding new toolings for the 'Western' produced by Dapol (HM70). Both locomotives featured a high standard of build quality and the same excellent level of detail applied to the first review sample of the Dapol 'Western' received in the *Hornby Magazine* office.

Both of our weathered samples also

proved to be smooth and quiet runners offering ample haulage capacity to handle an eight coach train of Bachmann Mk Is. A 21-pin DCC decoder socket is provided together with working directional lighting and illuminated headcode panels.

The weathering applied to the samples is typical of the 'Westerns' while in traffic, their expansive bodysides collecting grime and dirt rapidly, particularly around the grilles. The roof and underframe are particularly well done and the models have a neat grimy, rather than dusty appearance.

Only 250 of each of these 'Westerns' have been produced by KMRC with further versions due for release in BR maroon liveries with weathered finishes. (MW)

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Teak effect Thompsons arrive

Hornby has released the first of its LNER teak effect Thompson non-corridor carriages following on from the first round of BR crimson liveried vehicles released in 2012.

First to arrive are non-corridor composite 88383 and non corridor third 82657. The first of the Thompson non-corridor stock were built in 1947. They had steel panelled bodies over timber frames, but the first vehicles to enter traffic were finished in mock teak effect to match the wooden bodied Gresley teak coaches which preceded them.

Hornby's Thompson non-corridor stock needs almost no introduction, and they are superbly detailed and finished coaches which include vacuum brake pipes and coupling hooks, fully detailed underframes and interiors.

The bodyside window arrangements are also correct for the types of carriage with the oval window of the toilet in the composite coach being a particularly attractive. It is also worth noting that Hornby has produced a specific tooling for these carriages with square cornered windows.

Buildings and other lineside structures weather like everything else and are particularly affected by organic agents - moulds, lichens, mosses and so on. They leave their mark as clearly as water run-off or sooting.

LifeColor clearly has its eye on these nuances and has introduced two sets of acrylic paints in the 'Leaking and Stains' series. Identified as 'Damp Effect' and 'Grime Effect', each contains three authentic colours with names including 'Vegetable origin damp yellow', 'Dark mold' (sic), 'Dirty Green'. I found them convincing and at £8.50 a set, they're economical too.

The colours can be applied by spray or hand-brushing. As with all Lifecolor paints, the

HIS IS THE NINTH BOOK in this series of photographic albums and follows the format of the earlier volumes with a selection of colour images from the days of BR blue in the North West.

The pictures cover a wide spectrum of diesel and electric locomotives and multiple units reminding the reader of the immense variety to be found. Although not quite in the North West, Vale of Rheidol steam trains appear as does preserved GWR 'King' 4-6-0 6000 King George V on a railtour in the Welsh Marches. Separate sections deal with the Woodhead route and the Settle and Carlisle line

As with previous volumes, the captions are rather sparse but there are plenty of scenes of traction and infrastructure which should give inspiration to modellers and provide a useful resource for historians.

These volumes are limited to a print run of 1,000 copies each and some of the earlier books have now sold out. If you are interested in the subject matter the advice is to buy sooner rather than later. (IW)

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GBRf 2090 for 'OO' GBRitright GBRf GBRF

T IS NOW ALMOST 55 years since the first English Electric Class 20 entered service with British Railways but new liveries are still being applied to the survivors of this once numerous class.

The latest to be reproduced in model form is also the latest to adorn the Class 20 – GBRf Europorte orange and blue. The open access freight operator uses several Class 20s and in Autumn 2012 two were repainted in GBRf colours – 20901 and 20905. These locomotives are mainly used for London Underground train movements on the main line network, including deliveries of new 'S' stock, and railhead treatment trains.

Bachmann has produced a new model of 20901 in its new livery bringing the railfreight

story right up to date. It features correctly positioned high intensity headlights which are operational with the direction of travel and an otherwise standard Bachmann Class 20 bodyshell. This captures the shape, profile and look of these distinctive single cab locomotives exceptionally well.

The chassis inside is fitted with a 21-pin DCC decoder socket and space for a speaker. On the track our sample proved to be smooth running and quiet throughout the speed range and offered ample haulage capacity to handle an eight-coach train solo.

For those following the story of the Class 20 in model form or modelling the contemporary railway scene this is a must have model. (MW)

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Newly released is this BR black liveried version of the Bachmann Class 08 diesel shunter. This is the second time this livery has been applied to the model.

New liveries for Bachmann Class 08

Two new Bachmann Class 08s arrived in the *Hornby Magazine* office for review this month: BR black liveried 13050 and Bletchley depot's 08011 (D3018) in BR green as it was painted in the mid-1980s.

BR black has appeared on Bachmann's Class 08 in the past but not recently. The spartan livery has been reproduced to a high standard with highlights of red for the coupling rods and bufferbeams. Small early crests are printed on the engine room side.

The livery applied to 08011 is much more detailed and features all the embellishments added to the locomotive at Bletchley TMD. This includes white lining of the tyres and buffer heads plus white handrails and a grey cab roof – the only difference from the prototype is the lack of white painted pipework behind the cab steps!

Both of our samples performed superbly on the track. The low-geared mechanism of the Bachmann Class 08 is a joy to operate and provides faultless slow speed control,



T 222 PAGES, this softbound book is a very comprehensive guide to building wagon kits. Whilst suitable for beginners, there is something in here for everyone.

Starting with some basic research, the author moves on through plastic kits to resin and finally metal models. Along the way he looks at modifying kits to add detail or represent different prototypes, couplings, wheels, soldering and scratchbuilding in plastic. To finish, painting, weathering and even loading wagons are covered making it useful even for those who are happy to stick with ready to run models. The emphasis is on 'OO' gauge models but the techniques demonstrated are applicable to all scales.

Whilst there aren't any specific projects for the reader to follow step-by-step, there are plenty of generic techniques that are applicable in lots of situations. If you get stuck, keep a copy near to hand and the answer may well be in here.

Fully illustrated with colour photos throughout. (PP)

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Bachmann delights with 'N' gauge

RITISH 'N' gauge has come on leaps and bounds in the past five years, but the new model of the Ivatt '2MT' 2-6-0 for the scale is truly a model worth waiting for.

It was first announced by Bachmann for the Graham Farish brand in 2007 (HMI), but progress was slow not least because of the extremely compact nature of these mixed traffic, lightweight LMS designed locomotives.

With space at a premium in both the locomotive and tender the solution came in Bachmann's new coreless motor for 'N' gauge which launched onto the scene in the new 'WD' 2-8-0 (HM61) bringing with it renewed enthusiasm for the lvatt's production.

The Ivatt '2MT' was introduced in 1946 and in total 128 were built by both the LMS and BR with the last delivered in 1953. They were lightweight locomotives with a route availability of 2 and there work took them onto the Midland, Eastern, North Eastern and Western Regions of British Railways. In service they were tasked with light passenger and goods traffic and the last was withdrawn in 1967. Seven have survived into preservation.


The model

Bachmann's new '2MT' 2-6-0 is the second model of the class in 'N' gauge - the first being Minitrix's long out of production version from the 1980s – but the new version is a world away from what went before.

With the recent rise and rise in the quality of 'N' gauge steam locomotives it isn't surprising that the Ivatt continues that trend. From all angles Bachmann has done an outstanding job of recreating the structure and shape of the design with its narrow boiler, small driving wheels and low profile tender. More than that though, Bachmann has gone to the lengths of including fine detail such as separately fitted handrails, lamp irons, factory fitted brake pipes and other fixtures such as the tender handrails and steps. If that wasn't enough then there is also a detailing pack with each model containing cylinder drain cocks, cab doors, an alternative tender roof and front steps.

Below the frames all wheels have seethrough spokes while a near scale coupling distance between the locomotive and tender has been achieved. Equally neat is the fact that the power connections between the locomotive and tender are completely hidden. Another impressive point is the coupling fitted to the tender which offers a very neat appearance when rolling stock is coupled behind the locomotive.

Everywhere you look there is fine detail to appreciate and it is all finished off with



Bachmann's high standard of paint finish. Our sample was 46440 in BR lined black with early crests on the tender, but the Ivatt is also being released in BR lined green and LMS black.

Performance

With a tiny model like the lvatt 2-6-0, performance is always going to the first question. It has been designed to operate on a minimum of second radius curves in 'N' gauge and measures just over 110mm long and weighs only 42g. Don't let those numbers fool you into thinking its performance matches its dimensions - just like the real thing this little model punches above its weight!

The Ivatt has a beautifully balanced chassis which meant that we were able to run it, comfortably, with an eight-coach train of Bachmann Mk Is behind - much more than a Class 2 would ever be tasked with in the

normal run of duties.

The mechanism itself is fabulous, running silently throughout the speed range and offering perfect speed control. Pick-ups are located on all driving and tender wheels which helps too. Also in the tender is a 6-pin

DCC decoder socket which has, surprisingly, ample space for a standard Bachmann 6-pin

decoder.



The 'N' gauge Ivatt '2MT' may have had a long path to its birth, but the results speak for themselves. This really is a model worth waiting for and we are delighted that this diminutive steam locomotive – which has so many admirers - is now available for 'N' gauge. Well

done to all at Bachmann for what we reckon rates as one of the very best readyto-run 'N' gauge steam locomotives ever

produced! (MW)

BR BLUE TORNADO



ITH THE REPAINTING of new build Peppercorn 'AI' 4-6-2 60163 Tornado into BR lined blue, Hornby has released its promised new version of the locomotive for 'OO' gauge.

The model uses the dedicated tooling for 60163 which was first released in 2011 for the both the RailRoad and main catalogue ranges. This version is supplied with etched brass nameplates and features full livery detail.

The BR lined blue paint scheme has been applied to Hornby's exacting standards and features an attractive satin base coat topped off with fine white-black-white lining, cab side details and large BR crests on the tender

sides. The smokebox is also decorated with 'silver' hinge and handrail detail.

Like previous versions of the *Tornado* model, this one is devoid of cab glazing which would add greatly to the look of the 'Pacific', but, equally, this is simple to remedy. The smooth running chassis though is DCC ready and features an 8-pin socket which is located inside the boiler. Access is simple too.

On the track our sample performed equally well under both analogue and DCC control and proved itself more than capable of handling an eight coach train.

In keeping the *Tornado* story up to date this is a cracking model. (MW)



ULIAN HOLLAND explores 95 different named express trains from the UK. Each express is pictured, often several times, along with a brief history of the service. In addition, advertising material, timetables and even menu cards are reproduced. This really lifts the book and makes it appealing to a wider audience than rail enthusiasts.

A very comprehensive book, it's difficult to pick a highpoint from among the offerings. Top marks to the author for including the 'Condor' Britain's first express container service (the name comes from 'container door-to-door') hauled by the ever unreliable Co-Bo diesels. I suspect the validity of its inclusion will keep enthusiasts arguing for hours!

Of course if you are an enthusiast, the book will not only suggest services that you might wish to include on a model railway, but it could lead you toward the dangerous land that is collecting memorabilia. After all, if you are going to run the 'Golden Hind' (London Paddington to Plymouth) then who wouldn't wish to own a leaflet with a fabulous stylised 'Western' on the cover?

Illustrated profusely throughout, the production and printing quality is very high. The printing on reproduced advertising material is perfectly readable and the images, both monochrome and colour, as clear as the originals will allow. (PP)

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
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Hornby pushes forward with Rail Mass

Hornby has continued to push forward and grow the potential of its RailMaster computer control software. Now, as **MIKE WILD** explains, the eLink interface is making even more possible.

HERE WAS A TIME when control of a model railway came down to a simple analogue controller, but the advent of Digital Command Control (DCC) has changed that forever. We live in a world where the computer is king.

Historically although digital control has been around for years (as older modellers who bought Hornby's Zero I controller will remember) it hasn't always been easy to apply computer control to model railways. That changed when Hornby launched the first totally accessible DCC computer control software to operate with its Elite DCC controller in 2011 - RailMaster. Today Hornby continues to expand the software, its capabilities and flexibility.

Initially the system was totally focused on the Hornby product range, even in respect of accessory decoders and the like, but during the past 12 months 10 manufacturers' accessory decoders have been added to the system, offering greater flexibility for model railway operation. These include Hornby's R8247 and R8216 accessory decoders, ESU's Switch Pilot, Digitrax DS64, Gaugemaster's DCC 30, Lenz and NCE equipment amongst others.

An innovative approach has also been taken to locomotive control as RailMaster now includes a database of over 1,000 locomotives and multiple units with pre-set performance characteristics to make it even easier to get started. And this month the picture has changed drastically with the introduction of Hornby's new eLink interface.

Enter the eLink

The Elite was the driving force behind RailMaster, which is now on version 1.51. The programme had been designed around the Elite's operational capabilities and Hornby also introduced a firmware update to enhance its operation with RailMaster and its functionality with today's modern sound locomotives.

However, in July Hornby released its eagerly anticipated eLink interface which has been designed purely to operate with RailMaster. >>>

DIGITAL CONTROL

Its main feature is a faster processor for smoother operation – something very noticeable in use – which enables it to work in harmony with RailMaster and the increasing abilities of the software. For example, RailMaster is able to connect with up to eight additional devices resulting in a large amount of 'traffic' between the computer programme and eLink which this new device handles this with ease.

What is important to note is that the eLink is not a control device in its own right. In simple terms it's a 'black box' which connects a DCC model railway with a computer for operation with RailMaster. It has no buttons with its only external features being a green light to show that it is on, power and USB connections on one side and main track and programming track connections on the other side.

The specification means the eLink can control 9,999 locomotives, over 2,000 points and accessories and offers 4amps of power to the track, allowing plenty of capacity to operate a large number of DCC fitted locomotives. RailMaster can also be connected to a second eLink or Elite to provide a separate power supply for point operation, so if you were wondering what to do with your old Elite, keep it and use it for point control!

What really makes the eLink stand out though is its price - £84.99 buys an eLink and RailMaster together - all you need to complete the set up is a Windows computer. All connecting cables are included with the eLink and a full set of manuals is supplied in electronic PDF format, the argument being that if you're buying eLink you'll have a computer you can read the documents anyway. It is, by any measure, a very costeffective way of starting in Digital Command Control and especially in computer control.

On first connecting the eLink to RailMaster it will update the eLink's onboard programming to the latest version and it will also automatically install the driver software onto your computer on most operating systems. It couldn't be simpler to install and has been thoroughly thought out in terms of simple connection and operation.


The eLink also has a programming track output which can be used in the same way as

the Elite's programming track. However, now address and CV changes can be made through RailMaster with the system able to read all CV settings from any locomotive and store them in its database for later modification.

Adding handhelds

The eLink is just one part of a huge expansion for RailMaster. Right from the start its developers had a long term plan to bring more and more functionality to the software and one of the most exciting developments was released in the first half of this year – the option to add handheld devices to the system. Many model railways will need more than one controller and now RailMaster can cater for that as up to eight handheld devices or eight additional PCs can be connected to a main computer. This could be any combination of handhelds and PCs up to a maximum of eight.


The range of handheld devices suitable for use with RailMaster is impressive in their own



right and includes Apple iPhone and iPads, a range of Google Android phones and tablets running version 4 ('lce Cream Sandwich') or later, and even some Palm and Windows CE devices too. In all 18 different handheld devices are compatible – see table for the full list.

The larger tablets have advanced functions such as the ability to see both locomotive controls and a trackplan at the same time and even zoom into the plan for enhanced operation. However, even devices such as the Palm TX and iPhone will allow full control of points and accessories too, but without the zoom feature.

This list of devices makes RailMaster the most advanced and flexible multi-platform model railway control system anywhere that we've come across. To use a handheld device RailMaster apps can be downloaded using the links the PDF guide and RailMaster will instantly recognise the type of device you have and download the correct version. The developers recommend installing the free evaluation version first — which offers control of two locomotives and up to four points or accessories to see whether it suits your needs. The full version can be purchased for £9.99, for the first app, with further downloads for additional devices priced at £4.99.







In total there are 18 handheld tablets and phones which can be connected to RailMaster. These are just four of those options! The larger tablets can display both locomotive controls and trackplans (the latter with zoom function).

Making it work

Railmaster communicates with the handheld devices via wireless internet of the sort you might use at home. If you don't have wireless internet (virtually all modern broadband routers include it as standard) then it won't work, although you can purchase separate wireless network devices to do the same job. Equally, operation at exhibitions will need to be considered carefully. Hornby Magazine has been using this system on Bolsover through a typical broadband wireless router to use Palm TX devices with a Windows XP computer. The wireless router doesn't need an internet connection to provide the wireless network required for RailMaster and the router is transported to shows along with the other electrical equipment needed to operate the layout.

Assuming you do have a wireless internet, or network, connection to hand, all you need to do is type the static IP address of the main computer into the appropriate menu of Railmaster on the handheld device and it should run smoothly from then on. Full instructions for different operating systems and devices are included with RailMaster

while the software also makes it clear that an additional device is connected in a bar at the bottom of the screen showing icons for additional handhelds.

Some devices require more input than others for smooth performance. For example, Hornby Magazine was involved in trials with RailMaster on the Palm TX and while it worked well – and now works even better than ever – a detailed set up process was required. At the other end of the scale the Apple iPhone and iPad are very simple to setup and take a matter of minutes to connect to RailMaster.

The future

RailMaster is changing the face of model railway operation. Its simple matrix trackplans, locomotive data storage and expanding capacity make it very flexible and easy to use indeed. The new eLink is a revolution for the system and means that more of RailMaster's impressive abilities can be used to the full.

Further developments will include voice control and even better operation. *Hornby Magazine* will be bringing you more on this exciting system in the near future.

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
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














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Ingleton Sidings

Constrained by space and needing to entertain his children, **PAUL ALLEN'S** micro layout developed over time into a brilliantly atmospheric shunting puzzle which is appearing at *Hornby Magazine's* Great Electric Train Show this October. *Photography, Trevor Jones*.

T THE OUTSET, it was almost laughable to think that Ingleton Sidings would ever be shown at exhibitions because this modest little micro layout was originally designed to sit on the windowsill in a bedroom of a modern-day family home.

With three boys in the family it was perhaps inevitable that they would each go through the 'Thomas' phase and want a model railway layout to play with. Once I realised that my 9ft x 5ft, I7-turnout loft layout would never be finished, my attention turned to more achievable projects that might just fit into a child's bedroom. However, modern small bedroom sizes presented me with a problem – where could I locate such a layout?

Aside from the clutter in their bedrooms, each child had little or no spare space until I realised the potential of the windowsill. The size of Ingleton Sidings therefore, was always going to be pre-determined by those dimensions.

But what operational interest could realistically be achieved in such a small space that would also engage a young child for a significant period of time? A chance meeting with Phil Parker at the Warley exhibition alerted me to the late great Carl Arendt's website and from that point I was hooked on smaller layouts. I was particularly inspired by Alan Wright's epochal Inglenook Sidings, which fitted three sidings capable of holding five, three and three wagons plus a headshunt in a space of 4ft x I ft.

Now I had a specific challenge: could a standard 5-3-3 Inglenook shunting puzzle fit into a space of just 45in x 7in? Yes it can, but only just!

Struggling to build an overcomplicated and overstocked loft layout, I encountered a number of specific challenges and eventually

conceded I needed help. The local model railway club seemed the obvious port of call and looking back, that nervous first call to the club secretary proved to be pivotal. From there, I gained access to a wealth of expertise and developed some great new friendships.

Planning Ingleton

The good thing about an Inglenook shunting puzzle is the track plan is largely predetermined. The biggest challenge for the freelance builder is the application of the trackplan within the scene you intend to portray. For me, this was also restricted by the shallow depth of the layout. With a depth of just 7in – a shade over half of what Alan Wright

had to work with - Ingleton Sidings was clearly only ever going to enjoy half relief buildings and retaining walls. Fitting three sidings into that width was challenging enough and perhaps not prototypical but the objective was to create a layout that was operationally stimulating rather than completely accurate.


With a vision of how the layout might look in my mind, the baseboards were sourced from old scrap wood in the garage, code 100 track and turnouts were reclaimed from the loft project and the whole layout was operational within 12 hours. A second-hand Gaugemaster transformer and handheld controller were sourced for £40 from traders at the club's annual exhibition and Ingleton Sidings was born.

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Although the initial build took just 12 hours, much more had to be done. For example, there were no buildings, lighting or ballast, point motors needed to be installed and automatic uncoupling was just a pipe dream! However, a couple of evenings per week over the next six months soon enabled me to get the layout to a presentable standard.

The layout then spent the next two years sat on a child's windowsill before fate played a hand...

Exhibiting Ingleton

In January 2006, the club exhibition manager was in a panic. A number of layouts had pulled out of the March exhibition and he asked if anyone could help. Suddenly, Ingleton Sidings was in demand! A frantic period of modelling activity ensured the layout reached basic exhibition standard and the name Ingleton was rather unimaginatively created as a variation on the word Inglenook!

It was only several years later when exhibiting in Yorkshire, that I realised I had inadvertently named my layout after an area with considerable railway heritage. Clearly the layout is not modelled on the area because, as one visitor so excitedly pointed out recently, the stonework is the wrong colour!

The final challenge was how best to present the layout to the viewing public. Initially I contacted local double glazing companies to see if I could purchase a dummy presentation window which you often see in showrooms, but it soon became obvious this was either going to be difficult or expensive. It was only when working on the layout at home one day that I placed the layout temporarily on the ironing board and realised the dimensions were perfect.

The layout proved popular at the local exhibition and further bookings soon materialised. Enlisting the help of good friend John Witts at exhibitions, we often attracted envious comments from bemused large layout exhibitors. For us, setup would mean walking in with a layout under one arm, an ironing board under the other and a tiny bag of stock over the shoulder! We were operational within just 15 minutes!

The layout itself

Having established that the layout is in no way modelled on the Yorkshire town of Ingleton, it is perhaps a disappointment that the layout isn't based on any particular region. In recent years however, a brewery theme has emerged and through the addition of brewery wagons from towns and counties connected with my formative years, this would set the layout somewhere near Great Western/ Southern lines on the borders of Berkshire, Hampshire and Surrey.

I have long been fascinated by the idea of brewery layouts. With a background in advertising and marketing, the imaginative branding and colour schemes often bestowed upon rolling stock fascinate me. Given that the layout is presented on an ironing board, I dreamed up the 'Iron Brew' brand for Ingleton and the inevitable brewery paraphernalia was duly added to complete the scene.

The two buildings are both scratchbuilt and represent my first attempts into the art of structure modelling. Having just joined my local club at the time of construction, I am grateful for the help and guidance members gave me at the time. The benefits of club membership are often taken for granted, but I do believe there is no better place to gain the confidence to 'have a go.' I remember feeling that I had a safety net around me to help should I get out of my depth. I remember having a similar feeling when I took enamel weathering paints to my first £100 locomotive!

Good friend John Witts joined me at exhibitions in 2008 when invitations to some of the larger shows began to materialise. This proved to be the inspiration that Ingleton really needed. John's experience forced me to think more about how the layout was presented to the public. It had become clear to us at Barrow Hill that when sandwiched between larger layouts, Ingleton was being missed by visitors.

With John's immeasurable help, we began to devise a simple yet effective exhibition cabinet which would encase the ironing board to provide stability yet still highlight the central premise of the layout. In essence, John designed an exhibition stand in reverse. It ended up as a collapsible one piece frame with panelling at the rear to allow the public


to see how the layout is presented from the front.

A panel at the front allowed the shunting puzzle cards to be displayed and an electronic photograph frame was added to display Powerpoint slides which explained how the puzzle operated. The new cabinet raised the layout a further 10in off the ground giving Ingleton Sidings more of a presence in the exhibition hall and visitors a more comfortable viewing height. The addition of a CCTV monitor above the layout to show a live feed from a miniature camera together with a 6ft 5in long exhibition banner created further impact as the layout was now visible from any point across the exhibition hall due to its

Operating Ingleton

When it comes to shunting puzzles, rolling stock is simple and inexpensive. Just eight wagons and a small shunter and you are up and running! Normally, I use a Bachmann Class 08 diesel with a Class 03 as backup. These are selected for their slow running capability and relatively small size. Wagons are Bachmann and Dapol with the occasional Parkside kit thrown in for good measure. The burned out vans are adapted from Parkside and Airfix/Dapol kits. The dilapidated brake van always creates the most interest with the viewing public at exhibitions and it's certainly an unusual vehicle.

The layout operates a standard inglenook shunting puzzle. Using photographs of the wagons, the objective is to select at random five of the eight wagons and then shunt them onto the longest siding in the order they were selected. The puzzle can take up to 45 minutes to complete and more operational details can be found here at www.wymann.info/ShuntingPuzzles/

Lessons learned

The one thing that makes me proud of Ingleton Sidings is the reaction it encourages from exhibition visitors. People often comment on the simplicity, the practicality and the level of detail that can be achieved in such a small space. Many are inspired to go home and build similar layouts for themselves.

In fact through www.ingletonsidings.com I have had many messages of thanks for the inspiration the layout has provided - I even did an online interview with a group of modellers from Canada - and there are now many similar layouts joining the exhibition circuit. On one occasion, a visitor left an exhibition to go to a DIY store to buy the wood for his baseboards and at another exhibition a year later he showed me pictures of his finished project – an incredibly rewarding piece of feedback.

To build a successful layout your overriding objective should be to create a believable scene that transports the viewer to a special place in their imagination. In my view this is not created by the right number of rivets, or the right spacing between sleepers, although that can help, but by creating the right ambience which connects with the viewer. Aspects such as lighting, weathering and realistic operational speeds all help this.

Is Ingleton a success in these respects? At a recent exhibition one visitor stood motionless in front of the layout for around 20 minutes. He suddenly turned to me to thank me for transporting him right back to his childhood and fond memories of watching equally gritty sidings in operation in Manchester.

I'm currently at the planning stage of the next project and a number of possibilities are being considered. The overriding objective with all my modelling projects will always be to provide inspiration to others to get active and have a go for themselves. Providing inspiration, help and advice to others is the best way to repay those who have helped you along the way - and ensure our hobby will survive for generations to come.

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STEPL. Returns

Returning to the exhibition circuit at Hornby Magazine LIVE! in Hartlepool was *Hornby Magazine's* St Stephens Road. **MIKE WILD** updates the story on this BR Western/Southern Region layout.

T STEPHENS ROAD (SSR) made its debut on the exhibition circuit in September 2011, but since then it has spent more time in storage than at shows (HM73 and HM74)!

It is an unusual layout with its triangular format which, by virtue of the quickly made curved connection boards between

the scenic and fiddle yard boards, made it difficult to assemble and transport. However, all of that has now been put right and while it is still like a giant jigsaw to assemble, the layout now works reliably.

The deadline of

July 13/14 helped to
speed the rejuvenation of
SSR, which has seen two new
scenic sections built on the new
curved end boards, conversion to Digital
Command Control (DCC) and upgrading of
the locomotive fleet, in part, to feature sound
decoders.

In the final weeks before the show the station loops were all rewired so that they would remain live at all times as previously they relied on point polarity for power supply, the new Gaugemaster Prodigy controller had its connections made, locomotives were weathered, detailed and sound fitted, the scenery repaired in places and the scenic extension completed. On top of this the backscene boards have been fully repainted to freshen them up and the fascias and lighting pelmet have been repainted in grey to give the model a fresh new look. And just to add

to the workload, to fit in with the curved scenic extensions the lighting rig has been extended at each end too.

It has been a very busy time getting the layout ready, but the rewards were reaped when just an hour into the layout's first exhibition since April 2012 SSR settled

down and performed reliably throughout the weekend. With

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Motor

Disparagingly called 'motormen' by their steam colleagues, and largely ignored by railway historians, the men who drove diesel and electric multiple units made a vital contribution to the successful operation of the 20th century railway, as **EVAN GREEN-HUGHES** discovers.



HO CAN FORGET that first

Even that first trip on an electric unit was something to be marvelled at for, even though there was no view through the front, the effortless way that the unit charged through the countryside was in complete contrast to the noisy, slow and smelly steam trains we were used to. The biggest joy was that you could stick your head out of the window and enjoy the thrill of train travel without any danger of getting smuts in your eyes or muck on your best clothes!

Yet when it came to taking numbers all we were interested in were the locomotives, whether steam or diesel and when it came to getting that illicit cab visit it was the attraction of steam, with its roaring fire, which was number one. I can't ever remember anyone trying to get a sit in a DMU cab.

Those who drove units were sometimes regarded as being second class footplate crews and many steam drivers said anyone could drive the 'trams', 'buses' or 'bug-boxes', yet often they did not have the skill to do so themselves. Indeed many steam men tried and failed to master the new traction, not being able to cope with the added complexity of the mechanical systems or the rapid stop-start operations which had become possible.

Those who did make the change typically did not miss the steam engines and valued the clean working conditions, superior views and improved handling characteristics of the units while those who did miss steam often left the railway for good.

Although the term 'motorman' came to be used as something of an insult by those loyal to steam it was in common use and had a different meaning for many years before the modernisation of the 1950s, particularly on the Southern Railway where electric units were often the norm. Electric railways had come into widespread use 50 years before the railways were modernised; the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway had its 600v 32mile Liverpool-Southport line in 1904, the London Brighton and South Coast and the London and North Western had electric lines in operation by 1909 and the London and South Western had its third-rail from 1915. All these systems had men who had never set foot on or operated a steam engine, as did systems such as the London and Glasgow undergrounds.

A technical elite

In those early days the men who were to be entrusted with the new-fangled trains were chosen very carefully, for this was an era when not many people had technical expertise and as a result right up until the war years they were considered superior, rather than inferior to steam drivers.





This was famously the case at Waterloo Station where the driver's mess room and canteen was situated below the platforms. There was a long table in the middle of the room at which the motormen sat but where steam drivers, in their dirty overalls, were not welcome. Brighton men, particularly, regarded themselves as being at the top of the pile and of course motormen commanded the same pay as steam drivers. The status was accented by the uniform which the motormen were given

 not for them a donkey jacket and bib-andbrace. Instead they had a clean green jacket with pocket flaps and a green uniform cap.

Conditions on those early electric units were very primitive and drivers often had to stand in the small space which was allocated for a cab. Where a seat was provided it was a tiny tip-up affair on the rear wall and the driver's position was sometimes very near to dangerous electric components. Those of a nervous disposition had to get used to the loud clicks and bangs

which came from the equipment cupboards as some of the high-voltage contacts were made and broken throughout the journey. Speedometers were not routinely fitted even though speed limits were plentiful and, indeed, as late as 1974, this gave an excuse for the driver's union to blacklist some pre-War classes during a pay dispute, claiming that they were unsafe.

Dawn of the diesels

Diesels units came along many years after the electrics with the first railway to have an appreciable number of passenger-carrying vehicles being the Great Western, with its fleet of streamlined railcars from the mid-1930s onwards. There men were selected from the steam links, but unlike the Southern, they were not exclusively used on unit duties. The railcars had a wide cab with a proper seat, and good all-round vision for the centrally-seated driver. One old-hand driver, with 25 years' experience to his name, told a contemporary magazine that he was undecided whether he preferred steam to diesel: he liked the cleanliness and lack of wind in the new cabs but found it very difficult to get used sitting down at work when he'd spent a lifetime standing up!

When the first of the British Railways DMUs arrived in 1954 passengers who'd been drawn away by modern buses and trams flocked back

to the railway but some of the newly-trained drivers found it strange that every move they made was being observed and sometimes commented on by the people sitting behind the big window. There were issues with the limited amount of accommodation, too, with one of the hot topics being that the new units did not have sufficient room in the cab for stowage of the driver's bulky overcoat. This was eventually solved by putting in a full height cupboard in the Guard's compartment.

Drivers who, until then, had perhaps driven nothing larger than a motorbike and sidecar found the units difficult to cope with and many felt constricted in the small cab, a situation which was made worse by the practice of carrying a secondman. Despite the protestations of management, some could not maintain concentration unless they closed down the blinds at the back of the cab, thus invoking the wrath of those passengers who were looking forward to the view over the driver's shoulder. A heavy woollen uniform in green was issued which many immediately rejected, preferring instead to stay with their steam-era garb while later those who drove the Blue Pullman units found themselves wearing a white version, immediately gaining them the nickname of the 'ice cream men'. Like the green uniform use of this soon passed into history.

Surprising benefits

One distinctive advantage of the new units was the cleanliness and drivers soon found how to use this to their advantage. Birmingham Monument Lane drivers, who were amongst the first to work the new Derby Lightweights, soon found themselves driving trips to the coast as the new units became popular for use on excursions.

This type of duty gave a long break at the destination and drivers found that they could wear their best clothes under a biband-brace. As the new diesels did not need any looking after once the destination was reached they were parked up many a good day out at the seaside ensued.

Arrival of the units meant changes for the drivers as it soon became practice for one man to be rostered onto a depot to start up a fleet of trains and for the driver taking the DMU to book on much later than he previously would have done. This wasn't universally liked because many men wanted to prepare their own train, but in time it became common practice and later crews would start their shift at the local station, rather than at an engine shed.

However small the diesel unit cabs were, the drivers on the Southern Region (motormen having been re-designated as drivers in 1961) found themselves squashed into an even smaller space when the new British Railways Mk I-derived EMU sets began to come on stream, due to the requirement that most of the new units should have full width corridor connections. The half-cabs had a tip up seat but were at least initially much less draughty than many of the pre-War units they were replacing, as the cab door was in a vestibule behind the driver. Nowadays such half-cabs are commonplace but in those days they caused much comment.

The changeover from steam to diesel and electric multiple units has been recorded many times, but almost always from the point of view of lamenting the passing of steam. Little has been recorded about the men who worked the early multiple units, which is a shame because that is now just as much a part of history as is the end of steam.

Today's units, with their wheelslip and traction control devices, electronic aids, powerful disc brakes and comfortable cabs are a world away from these primitive early examples and today's drivers live in a world much different from that of those early motormen.

Perhaps more attention should be paid to this aspect of railway history, which was just as long ago as steam, but is possibly a lot less well remembered.

SMOOTH RUNNING

What can I do to keep my models' mechanisms running smoothly?

There are three vital steps to keeping model locomotives running smoothly and they relate to all scales and gauges.

Firstly the wheels need to be kept clean either using a wheel cleaning station such as Gaugemasters or a wheel cleaning brush like that produced by Peco. Secondly pick-ups need to be kept clean and free from dust and dirt so that they provided consistent power connections between the wheels and motor.

Thirdly the geartrains in modern models need oiling, but only lightly. Excessive oiling can be just as bad for a model as underoiling. If in doubt apply a small amount, run the model so that the oil works into the geartrain and if they still look dry add another very small amount.


Combined these three steps will keep your locomotives in tip-top condition.



THE RIGHT OIL

What type of oil should I use for readyto-run locomotives?

For lubrication of plastic gears a light model oil should be used. For metal gears a heavier oil can be used. Always check the manufacturer's instructions sheet for any specific oiling requirements as some models need oiling before first use.



ENANCE



l've tried various track rubbers, but all of them leave deposits behind after cleaning. Is there a less messy method of keeping railheads clean?

Track rubbers are a difficult subject as there are so many

choices. We've tried many different types and the best we have found have been from Peco and C&L Finescale. The C&L track rubber is the larger of the two types and has proved to be long lasting.

To reduce the chances of track rubbers leaving deposits,

clean your track regularly so that only a light pass is needed to keep it fresh and clean. Also, we keep a separate track rubber for cleaning up after scenic work or track weathering as removing glue and paint can take their toll on track rubbers.

CLEANING PICK UPS

My locomotives have erratic running qualities on straight track as well as points. Is there a reason for this?

It sounds like some of the pick-ups on your locomotives aren't making permanent contact with the back of the wheels. Most 'OO' gauge locomotives have wiper pick-ups and these collect dust, dirt and fluff while a model is in motion. To clean these delicate components we use Deluxe Materials Track Magic which restores the pick-ups to a shine and, in our experience, has resolved any performance problems of this nature.

STALLING ON POINTS


I have had trouble with locomotives stalling on pointwork and when passing through loops in certain directions. Can you offer any advice on how to resolve this?

There could be dirt between the running rail and the blades of the point. The most effective way is to use a track cleaning fluid such as Track Magic.

Applying this fluid onto the inside faces of the blades will help conductivity and remove dirt. We now use Track Magic for all of Hornby Magazine's layouts.

UPPORT STRUCTURE

How do I support baseboards and at what height should I set them?

There are many choices when it comes to supporting baseboards from simply placing them onto cupboard units to mounting brackets on walls and leg systems.

Our preferred method for our exhibition layout is trestles. These are formed of two sets of legs with hinges at the top and a chain between the lower braces which then fold out to form an 'A' shape. This makes assembly and dismantling of our exhibition layouts quick, but they do take up a lot of space which might make them unsuitable for home use.

Another alternative is a bespoke leg design to suit your particular requirements. When building Topley Dale for the Hornby Magazine office we required the maximum amount of



view of the operations. A happy medium, we reckon, is about 3ft 6in off the ground.

THE TOOLS

What tools do I need to build baseboards?

Baseboard construction calls for a number of tools. The basics are a pencil, tape measure, a straight edge and a set square for marking out, and then either a handsaw or electric jigsaw, a screwdriver, G-clamps, electric drill and a 6.5mm drill bit to complete the job.

Power tools such as a jigsaw or electric screwdriver might appear to be a costly investment but they do save time and a considerable amount of exertion too. However, if you go to a timber merchant's - as opposed to all bar the largest DIY stores - they will often have a cutting service allowing to you have all the components you need to make baseboards cut to size while you wait. This can be a great saving when it comes to the time required to assemble baseboards.

The short answer is no, you don't have to. We do recommend that baseboard frames are glued - using PVA wood glue - and screwed together, but sometimes it can be beneficial to only screw the top surface onto the frame meaning that, should you wish, it can be replaced in the future for the frame to be reused.



SEBOARD MANUFACTURERS

I'm really not keen on woodwork, is there a company that will make bespoke units for me?

There are several companies, and even retailers, who will make baseboards to order to suit your needs. Taking your specification along will result in a quote for the cost. Baseboard builders include

WIRING

What is the best way of routing wires underneath a board?

The most effective route for wires is one where they are kept out of harm's way. The best way to do this is to drill holes through baseboard cross members so that wires can pass through, keeping them away from the chance of being snagged. Most layouts will require a large number of wires so we either drill a series of 8mm holes in the relevant positions while installing wiring or drill a limited number of 22mm holes - usually three to a cross-member - for wires to pass through.

TO SEAL OR NOT TO SEAL

Do I need to seal my baseboard before starting work on the model railway, and what should I use?

Wood naturally changes shape and expands and contracts depending upon air temperature and moisture. Sealing baseboards can help reduce this, but perhaps the greatest benefit is if you paint the underside of your board a light colour such as white, grey or light grey. This will make the job of seeing the wiring underneath easier in the future. Emulsion paints will do the job well - after all, indoor layouts aren't exposed to the elements and so they don't require special treatments.



Q

I'm planning a portable layout and I want a simple way to connect the boards together. Can you suggest a way of doing

Our method of choice for joining baseboards together is to use M6 coach bolts with 30mm washers and M6 wing nuts. By simply drilling a 6.5mm hole through the ends of a pair of baseboards they can then be bolted together quickly

and with good results every time.

If you are working with finescale track it will be worth using pattern makers dowels as well to assist with accurate alignment while it is also possible to use either case clips or loose pin hinges.

FIXTURES AND FITTINGS

What screws should I use to join baseboard timbers together?

The answer all depends on the type of materials you are using and what thickness they are. We normally have a stock of 4.0×30 mm and 4.0×40 mm screws to hand which suit most purposes. For fixing backscenes it is handy to have 3.5×25 mm screws





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


CORK PROPERTIES

I've seen many references to cork underlay. What advantages does it have and why do so many layouts use it?

Cork sheet and strips have been part of the railway modeller's armoury for years. It provides a flexible barrier between the track and baseboard surface and prior to applying any ballast it can reduce the noise of model rolling stock.

However, in our view its purpose is more cosmetic in forming a ballast 'shoulder' beneath a running line. In this respect this material is very useful and it can be



FLEXIBLE TRACK




I'm making the step from set track to flexible track, but how do I cut flexible track to make it fit?

Flexible track can be cut with tools as basic as a hacksaw, but if you have a lot of joints to make then it will be worth investing in a mini drill with a cutting disc. This speeds the process and allows you to make more accurate and cleaner cuts through the rail.

However, if you don't want to splash out on power tools, Xuron produces a very handy track

cutting tool which leaves a neat end to rails and is suitable for use with all grades of 'OO' and 'N' gauge track. It is quick, convenient and user friendly. The most important point for cutting track is to measure twice and cut once, just like the golden rule of woodwork. The more accurate your measurements and cuts are the better your trains will run in the end.







IN BRIEF

Can you recommend track pins which don't bend - I'm having problems with my current choice.


For our layouts we use Peco or Hornby track pins of the larger diameter type Cat Nos. ST-280 and R207. Both will require a 1 mm hole to be drilled through the centre of a sleeper before



being hammered home, but they are stronger and much more resilient to bending.

What is the minimum radius that I can use with flexible track?

Most current ready-to-run locomotives are designed for use on a minimum of second radius curves - the equivalent of 438mm radius. However, where possible we would recommend third radius curves of 505mm radius as this will allow a more realistic appearance for trains traversing curves and also, should you wish, more of the additional details supplied with locomotives to be fitted.



The main difference between code 100 and code 75 rail is the profile of the rail itself. Code 100 has a larger total height to the rail itself which allows older models with larger flanges to be used. It is also more robust than code 75 rail which has a finer rail profile and a more authentic appearance. For most modellers, code 75 simply looks better.

How do I set tracks the right distance apart?


Parallel running lines should be 6ft apart with a gap of 24mm between the sleeper ends in 4mm scale. Peco Streamline points will help set this gauge, but for a more accurate measurement Peco produces a 6ft way gauge for 'OO' which also includes a gauge for platform height.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

STEP BY STEP JOINING RAILS




Peco rail joiners for both code 100 and code 75 track, as used here, come in pairs. They need to be separated by flexing the thin metal joint between the two joiners until they snap. Individual rail joiners can then be added to the rail ends of points without any modification.




When joining track it is essential that both rails go fully into the rail joiners, where they are conducting or insulating joiners. Use a flat and level surface, bring the two track sections together and gently push them together.



To fit rail joiners onto flexible track, the chairs (which hold the rails in place) need to be removed on the end sleeper. Use a craft knife to carefully slice the chairs off working downwards towards the baseboard surface. Rail joiners will then slide onto the rail end above the sleeper.



Insulated rail joiners work in exactly the same way, apart from that they stop electricity passing from one track section to another. Here insulated rail joiners have been added between these points to stop electric shorts.



Once together you should have neat rail joints with the sleepers neatly tucking underneath the joiners. If you are assembling flexible track up to a point you will also need to trim the ends of the sleepers on one track to fit, usually the first three as shown here.



There are only six really important tools for laying track, although naturally there are specialist tools which you might like to add to the toolbox. The raw essentials are a craft knife for removing sleepers, snipe nose pliers for holding track pins, side cutters in case you need to remove a track pin, a pin hammer, a hacksaw or minidrill with a cutting disc for cutting flexible track and a pin vice with a Imm drill bit to drill holes through sleepers for track pins.

Beyond this you may want to consider the highly useful Tracksetta range of gauges. These are available in straight and curve radius formations and assist in laying track to the right radius. They are particularly useful for forming curves from flexible track and are available in both 'OO' and 'N' gauge.

Once you progress from track laying to wiring you will also need a soldering iron and a couple of other tools which are detailed in the electric section of this booklet.

JOINING RAILS



How do I join rails together successfully and what is the purpose of plastic rail joiners?

There are two types of rail joiner - metal rail joiners which are used to conduct electricity from one section of rail to the next and plastic rail joiners which are used to stop electricity reaching the next track section.

Both types of rail joiner are available for 'OO', 'N', 'O' and all other scales with different tolerences for different rail profiles, so make sure you check the packaging when purchasing these items.

Set track pieces come with rail joiners pre-fitted, but Peco streamline pointwork and all types of flexible track come

without any fittings on the end. To fit rail joiners to Peco points simply select the rail joiner and slide it onto the end of the rail. For flexible track cut just the chair from the end sleeper with a craft knife and then slide a rail joiner onto the rail end. It will sit neatly between the top of the sleeper and the bottom of the rail.

When joining two lengths of track it is essential that both rails connect properly into the rail joiners on each side of the joint - any variance on this will result in derailments.

IN BRIEF

I would really like to add point rodding to my layout, but I have come unstuck in trying to find a suitable product. Can you recommend a manufacturer?

Point rodding has generally been a subject tackled by some of the more dedicated modellers, but recently Wills has produced a new kit of components in plastic to replicate point rodding (HM74) for the rest of us. This kit includes cranks, supports and point rodding bars and will do exactly what you want it to without the need to work with delicate metal components.

CHOOSING TOOLS



What tools do I need for model railway electrics?

Only a small number of tools are essential for model railway electrics - a soldering iron, wire strippers, wire cutters and a small electrical screwdriver are all you really need.

In terms of the soldering iron, a 25Watt 'iron will do all that you need it to while a multi-gauge wire stripper will be a very handy tool to have available.

OOP WIRING

Can you explain how to wire up a loop with live frog points and the differences from doing the same job with insulated frog points?


Electrofrog - more accurately described as 'live frog' points - provide more consistent running qualities for model locomotives but they bring with them the need for more care when it comes to electrical circuits.

If you have a loop with live frog points you will need insulated rail joiners in each pair of rails of the loop (see diagram A). A power supply then needs to be added at the toe end of each point forming the loop so that both ends are fed. For the simplest method we recommend fitting

insulated rail joiners at opposite ends of each track of a two track loop so that a train in both loops can be isolated at the same time by simply setting the points against them.

Insulated frogs require none of these as they can transmit electricity in both directions and the insulated frog of the point prevents short circuits. To produce the same loop arrangement with insulated frog points requires only power feed (see diagram B), but it could result in locomotives stalling on the insulated section of the point.

WHAT ARE THE ALL THOSE WIRESFOR?

Model railway electrics appear very daunting to me, especially when I see how many wires are hidden beneath a layout. Is it very difficult to wire a model railway?

Most model railway wiring is actually quite simple, but there are ways of making it more complicated. When you see another modeller's wiring it can appear daunting, but much of what is there is simple repetition of the same circuit to achieve the same actions, such as power feeds and point motor changing, in different areas of a layout. For example: each point motor of the traditional solenoid type will require three wires – two positive feeds (one to each coil) and one negative – or common return – running between the control panel and point motor. Each point motor needs the same circuit to run back and forth from a control panel, hence the large number of wires which can appear underneath a model railway.


The most important part of model railway wiring is to keep things simple and work with a colour code. Our code is black and red wire for outer circuits, blue and yellow for inner circuits, green, orange and white for point motors and brown and purple for accessories. This means that we can always be certain of what particular wires are there for.

We also annotate baseboard power connections so that we know what connection does what in the future should anything go wrong.

BASEBOARD CONNECTIONS

I want to make my layout portable, but what can I use to disconnect the wires and reconnect them as necessary?

There are two main types of connector which are used for underboard baseboard connections – computer style 25-way 'D'-connectors and plug-in terminal blocks. 25-way 'D'-connectors require some skill with a soldering iron because the pins are very close together and once wired



any modifications can be time consuming to make. For Hornby Magazine's layouts we standardised on plug-in terminal blocks from Squires Model and Craft Tools (01243 842424). These are similar to electrical connector blocks and have screw fittings to connect wires to them. The two parts are male and female and they are very simple to use and wire up, requiring no soldering at all.

How do I solder wires onto rails for power feeds?

Soldering wires onto rails is a simple five-step process. We recommend 7/0.2 multi-core wire for this job (seven strands of 0.2mm diameter wire inside the insulation). A standard lead free solder will be perfect for this job.

First drill a 2mm hole in the baseboard between the ends of a pair of sleepers where you want to route the wire. Next bare the end of a length of wire by about 20mm using wire strippers and pass the wire through the hole. Having heated up a soldering iron apply solder to the bare end of the wire and touch the soldering iron against it so the melted solder covers the bare end of the wire. Finally, hold the wire against the rail side with a pair of snipe nose pliers, reheat the solder and it will flow onto the rail. Move the soldering iron away, allow the solder to cool then let go of the wire. Job done.



The first step is to strip around ISmm-20mm of insulation from the end of your wire using wire strippers. Stripping this much means the wire can be more easily hidden from view on a scenic layout.


Next, using multi-core wire such as this, the strands need to be twisted together to create a solid end to the





Tin the end of the wire by heating up the wire and introducing a small amount of solder. This will make it easier to attach to the rail in the next step.

Holding the wire firmly against the rail side reheat the solder on the end of the wire so that it melts onto the rail. Be careful not to apply too much heat to the rail, or the sleepers will melt.



ROCK FROMATIONS

How do I make rock formations for my '00' layout?

There are a number of options when it comes to making rock formations. Several manufacturers, including Woodland Scenics and Noch. produce moulds which can be filled with casting plaster such as Woodland Scenics Hydrocal to make realistic rocks of varying descriptions. The moulds vary in size from large single pieces to multiple small rocks in one.


Another alternative, and new to the market, is Deluxe Materials Create and Shape which has been designed as a multi-purpose finish with one result being realistic rocks. This material bonds to virtually any surface including wood, plastic and plaster bandage and allows unique rock formations to be produced with just a few minutes' work. However, you will need to study real formations to make the most of this product.

The photograph here shows the rock formations created for Hornby Magazine's Topley Dale layout which uses Woodland Scenics' rock moulds as their basis.

What glue is the best for fixing down ballast?

By far the best method for fixing loose ballast down is diluted PVA wood glue. Mixed with water to a 50:50 ratio, and with a drop of detergent added to remove any surface tension from the water, it will flow into the ballast and secure it in place. Be prepared to allow it to dry for 24 hours and don't be tempted to 'poke' it too early – you will disturb your hard work!



When I apply diluted PVA glue to my ballast it always moves it out of place. How do I stop this happening?

This is a simple problem to fix. All you need to do is to wet the ballast first before applying any glue. We use a plant water mister, available from all gardening and DIY stores, and fill it with tap water with an added drop of detergent to remove any surface tension from the water. Spray the water solution over your ballast then apply your diluted PVA glue – your ballast will now stay where you want it to.

20 FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



I don't want to go to the trouble of loose ballasting my layout, are there any alternatives without resorting to foam?

There are a number of products available to make ballasting easier. Gaugemaster produces its own range of pre-ballasted foam underlay which has been designed to fit the Peco, Hornby and Bachmann code 100 track systems. It can also be used with Peco code 75 track.

Gaugemaster also now produces kits of foam underlay to go underneath points which come with everything you need except glue. The pre-ballasted underlay is flexible and available for both 'OO' and 'N' gauge.


WHAT IS IT FOR

I've seen a product called polyfibre in the Woodland Scenics range, but I can't see how it can be used. What is its purpose?

Polyfibre can be a very useful material when used well. In its packaged form it appears of little use, but by teasing out small clups it can be turned into bushes and scrubs easily. It can also be used to make long hedgerows as shown by the

photograph of St Stephens Road. Our method is to tease out the polyfibre into the shape we want, spray paint it with Railmatch frame dirt or a similar dark brown and then sprinkle Woodland Scenics fine blended green turf onto the wet paint. For added variation a little Woodland Scenics light green or burnt grass coarse turf can provide a different look to a finished bush.






BUDGET STATIC GRASS

I've seen layouts which make good use of static grass, but the equipment appears expensive. Is there a budget option for applying static grass?

The cheapest method for applying static grass is a puffer bottle. This plastic bottle is filled with grass fibres, shaken to create a static charge on them and



then 'puffed' onto the layout to add static grass. The results are good and it is a particularly useful tool for applying static grass around buildings. The price: just over £4 from Noch's UK distributor Gaugemaster – gaugemaster.com



Which grade of loose ballast should I use for my '00' gauge layout?

Hornby Magazine's 'OO' gauge layouts use two grades of Woodland Scenics ballast to create their final look – fine grey blend and medium grey blend. Combined together in roughly even amounts these two products give, to us, a realistic look to finished ballasting.



How do I reproduce water in model form?

One of the cheapest options for making water is to use layers of varnish. This is a time consuming process requiring coats to be built up over a number of days, but it can reap rewards with patience.

For the scene above, which is modelled in 'OO' gauge, our choice of water product is Woodland Scenics Realistic Water – a resin based product which dries clear once poured and sets in 24 hours. It can be built up in layers too which adds to the potential for creating deep water.

To create realistic model water first paint the base of your river/stream or canal a suitable colour. It is also crucial to make sure that there is a barrier at each end of a baseboard to stop the 'water' material from running away once poured. In our case we used masking tape to keep the Realistic Water in place while it cured.

There are other products on the market including Deluxe Materials Scenic Water, Solid Water and Making Waves products plus Dapol's Modelling Water, Faller Natural Water and Premium Water and Noch Water Effects, all of which can produce realistic looking water.



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CHOOSING A FIRST KIT

How do I choose a first rolling stock kit to build? What are the pitfalls?

First, buy a modern kit. Some real horrors are lurking on second-hand stalls around the country which will be enough put off even the keenest modeller. Parkside and Cooper Craft both produce kits that go together well with plenty of

Next, pick a simple prototype. While unusual subjects are interesting, a box van or open wagon is a better proposition. There aren't too many parts and it's fairly obvious where they all go. Hoppers are a challenge too, with very few solid fixing points for the parts. That's not to say that you won't be able to build them, just that a simple kit is more likely to be finished and then you can move on to the complex ones.

Apart from this, the only problem you are likely to find is finding suitable couplings. Those included with kits aren't usually very good but Bachmann sells its own as spare parts so they will match your ready-to-run stock.





GLUING PLASTIC



What type of glue should I use for assembling a plastic kit?

The best glue is a liquid solvent. Hold the two parts to be joined together and apply a little by brush to the joint. It will run in by capillary action and dry almost instantly.

Sometimes a plastic cement is useful too for holding larger parts or where you need to fiddle with a joint to get it perfect - choose one with a long nozzle rather than a tube as this allows careful placement of tiny amounts of glue.

Be careful with all glues and solvents. Use them in a well-ventilated space and use the smallest amounts you can get away with. If any liquid glue finds its way onto a detailed surface, leave it to dry. Don't try to remove it as you'll just make matters worse.

BUFFERS AND FITTINGS

I've bought a resin locomotive body kit, but I need to find buffers and other fittings to complete it. Where can I get these?

The first source is the manufacturer of the resin body kit. It may be able to supply parts itself, and if not should be able to point you in the right direction.

If they can't, many traders at exhibitions will supply these but if there aren't any exhibitions near you at the time, in my experience the best starting point is the Alan Gibson Workshop - www.alangibsonworkshop.com - which produces a huge range of fittings for all sorts of locomotive classes.

Don't be afraid to use parts that aren't sold



for the particular model. If you use a prototype photograph as a guide, as long as the fittings look realistic enough for you, use them.

26 FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

BACKDROP BUILDINGS

I've been considering building card buildings as a backdrop for my layout. Can you suggest sources for this type of model?

A lot depends on what sort of background you are after. For a range of shops, you can't do better than Superquick which produces some very easy to assemble models designed for background use.

If it's industrial units you require then Scalescenes.com produces a nice free model to give you a feeling for the range. Construction is more involved than Superquick kits but the instructions are excellent. You do have to print the parts yourself but that allows you to make as many kits as you require and if there is a problem during building, it is a simple job to reprint replacement parts.

Apart from this, any of the card building ranges advertised in Hornby Magazine will work. You may need to alter them to fit the space but card buildings are ideal for this since the material can be easily modified with a sharp knife.

SOURCING WHEEL

I've recently bought a wagon kit and it is supplied without wheels and bearings. Which are the best wheels that I can use?

Metal wheels are best. Romford wheels used to be the choice for 'OO' modellers but nowadays Hornby and Bachmann produce useful packs of spare wheels very cheaply. Other brands can be finer which may cause problems unless your track is set up for them. Most UK wagons ran on 3ft diameter wheels, which equates to 12mm in 4mm: Ift scales.

Bearings are available from several places with Alan Gibson being the largest supplier. For most plastic kits, 'top hat' bearings will probably work best. They are called this because they have a little brim around the edge to stop them falling too far into the axlebox.

Possibly the simplest option is to buy wheel and bearing packs from Parkside – the same ones it supplies in its kits. £1.85 gets you two axles of Romford wheels and four bearings, enough for a wagon.

A LEVEL CHASSIS


How do I ensure that a chassis sits straight and level when it is complete?

While kit instructions usually have you building the body and then adding the chassis parts, we prefer to fix the solebars to the floor so they can be tested. Make sure the axles are parallel with each other and perpendicular to the sides. The wheels should rotate freely.

At this stage you should be able to place the chassis on a piece of glass or small mirror with all the wheels touching the surface. If they don't a gentle twist might be enough to fix the problem. If more adjustment is required, pack a little plastic under one end of a solebar.

Test the chassis by pushing it around your layout. You will need to fix a little weight on it with Blutack first to simulate the completed vehicle, but then it should run around without derailing. If all is well then you can be confident to move on with construction of the body.





TRANSFER APPLICATION

I've built a number of wagon kits but when I apply the transfers the backing can clearly be seen on the model. How do avoid this in the future?

The backing shows up as a silvery sheen because of tiny air bubbles trapped underneath. Ideally transfers should be applied to a smooth gloss surface. Spraying gloss varnish such as Humbrol Clear where you intended to place the decal solves the problem but you'll then need another varnish to 'matt' the surface and protect the transfer from handling.

An alternative is to use a decalfix solution. Apply the transfer, pat it dry with kitchen towel and then paint on some Decalfix. This softens the transfer and draws it over details reducing and even eliminating the sheen.



The transfers you use also affect the results. Modern types tend to have a lot less transfer film around the edges of the printed area than older ones. Methfix and Pressfix transfers don't suffer at all from the problem but can be harder to use than waterslide.

DIGITAL COMMAND CONTROL (DCC)

LEARNING

I'm new to DCC and I'm learning about the different terminology. What is a function and how do they

A function is an action controlled by a decoder. This could be lighting, sounds or in the case of advanced and more powerful decoders a smoke generator. Basically anything other than driving the locomotive is controlled by a function.

Functions can only be controlled by a handset and are number from zero upwards.

The total number of functions available on a decoder varies depending on what they control - a standard diesel model with directional lights will normally have only one function to turn them on or off, but other models require four function decoders to operate all of their lights.

Sound fitted models have made the greatest use of functions with some decoders including more than 20 sound functions. All of these are controlled by the keypad on a DCC controller, but beware, some older Digital controllers only have a limited range of function controls



DEODER DIFFERENCES

What is the difference between a 6-pin, 8-pin and 21-pin decoder?

As DCC has evolved so have decoders. All three types of decoder have the same basic abilities - to control a locomotive under DCC but there are more advanced versions available as 21-pin decoders while 6-pin decoders can be great space

The 6-pin decoder is generally reserved for the 'N' gauge market, although as the 'OO' gauge manufacturers strive to produce ever smaller locomotives - such as Hornby's soon to be released Sentinel 4wDM shunter and Bachmann's Fowler 'IF' 0-6-0T - the 6-pin socket has found favour in the larger scale too.

The 8-pin socket is still the most common in 'OO' gauge ready-to-run, but in recent times all manufacturers have been moving towards use of the 21-pin socket where possible for its advanced abilities for locomotive and sound control.

To be sure of the decoder type you need manufacturers all now specify on the box label which type of decoder connect is required. It should also be noted that 21-pin to 8-pin and 8-pin to 21-pin converter harnesses are available too.

SOURCING BRITISH SOUNDS



I've been impressed with DCC sound from Hornby and Bachmann, but I would like to equip more locomotives. Where can I get sound decoders from?

There are several companies which now have an established reputation for producing DCC sound decoders. The majority offer ESU LokSound decoders with a smaller number offering

the upcoming range of sound decoders from Zimo.

Chief amongst sound decoder producers for British sounds are South West Digital, Howes Models, Digitrains, DC Kits

in conjunction with Legomanbiffo, Olivia's Trains and Keytes of Essex amongst others. The panel lists the contact details for known sound decoder suppliers.

CONFIGURATION VARIABLES



What is a CV value and how do I change them?

A CV value – or Configuration Variable – is data stored on a decoder which controls the way it operates. CVs can be used to vary the acceleration or deceleration of a locomotive, control its top speed, change the volume of a sound decoder and even alter the brightness of lights.

The digital code of CV values allows us to take full control of locomotives and their performance. They can be changed using any DCC handset using either the main line or programming track where those two options exist. Methods of altering CV values vary between controllers, but most will ask

for the CV setting you wish to change – such as CV63 for sound volume – followed by the control parameter you wish to enter. It is essential to consult your decoder manual to find out the maximum and minimums for each CV setting as there is a lot more to this area of DCC control than first meets the eye.

MEMORY CHALLENGE

I like the idea of DCC control, but I don't relish the challenge of remembering all the addresses for my locomotives. Is there a commercially available computer control system which can link with DCC?

The most recent entrant to the computer control market is Hornby with its RailMaster computer programme which allows you to give each locomotive a bespoke name or



number (usually the one of the model itself). This originally operated through Hornby's Elite DCC controller, but this has now been replaced, in terms of RailMaster, by the new e-Link controller which is essentially a black box connecting a layout to a computer.

RailMaster can store as many locomotives as you wish and provide groups within the locomotive listing to allow you to more easily navigate a larger fleet of locomotives. However, its capabilities are far beyond this as it has a matrix track diagram which can be designed to reflect any model railway, it can accommodate route setting, automation and control of accessories such as points, signals, turntables and more.

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While it is possible to install a DCC decoder in any locomotive, older models will take more time and care. This Bachmann split chassis Gresley 139' 0-6-0 was

I have a large collection of old locomotives which pre-dated DCC. Can they be fitted with decoders?

the subject of a full feature in HM62.

Yes! It is possible to install a DCC decoder in any locomotive, but without a socket it does mean that a decoder will have to be hardwired to the locomotive.

This means isolating the locomotives pick-ups from the motor connections and connecting the power supply to the decoder first. However, it is essential with this type of installation to ensure that all bare wire ends are fully insulated afterwards to avoid a short.

In Hornby Magazine we have produced several features over the years explaining how to hardwire decoders onto Bachmann split chassis locomotives (which are the most challenging models to do DCC fit) while some of our more recent projects have also seen the factory fitted decoder socket removed in favour of hardwiring.

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
