

Editorial

EXCELLENCE IN N

I have always been attracted to the smaller scales as a modeller, whether railways, aircraft, or anything else that came to hand. 1/144 in aircraft modelling has undergone a transformation in recent years with any number of highly-detailed kits now covering not just civil aviation - as for many years was its sole province - but now the most intricate toolings of military aircraft types from every period of history, often

designed to a standard that for many years was wanting in 1/72 and larger.

So naturally I find myself drawn to N Gauge - not just for the options it permits in terms of space, but for the sheer delight of seeing the exquisite detail of fine engineering reduced in size. Tony Wright's article this month illustrates what can be achieved in the smaller scale, and has me wondering if maybe that layout based Schelklingen in the 1980s might not be beyond my competence after all...









ACCURASCALE

Accurascale's pre-TOPS BR Hopper Wagons Are Back. The company has produced a new run of their first model for the British market, the 24.5ton coal hopper wagon, which later received the TOPs code 'HUO', in pre TOPS condition in new running numbers and identities.

A total of 5,263 wagons were built by BR from 1954 for transporting coal and coke throughout Britain until their withdrawal in the mid 1980s, with many entering private use at collieries upon retirement by British Rail. The model, which is of the 3121 (1958), 3221 (1959), 3314(1960), 3374 (1961), 3426 (1962 - listed 1/154 pattern but the design is actually

identical), and 3437 (1962) pattern, marked Accurascale's debut in the British market in 2018 and sold out completely in pre-TOPS guise within a few months of arrival. Due to customer demand, they have now produced four new packs of three wagons in pre-TOPS guise with new running numbers, allowing modellers to lengthen their rakes of wagons as well as cater for modellers who missed out first time round and/or are new to the brand.

The humble hopper features a wealth of detail and fidelity that includes sprung buffers, NEM coupling housing, RP25 110 darkened profile wheelsets, factory-fitted wire handrails, extra fine factory-fitted detail plastic parts and

individual lettering and markings from real wagons, which are themselves built to scale tolerances to allow easy conversion to EM and P4 standards.

Due to the COVID19 pandemic manufacturing time has been limited in China, resulting in a lower than desired production run size. It is recommended that you order early to avoid disappointment, as witnessed with the recent PFA wagons selling out within hours of going on sale. Each pack of three wagons is priced at £69.95, with a bundle deal for all four packs for £250 available on the website with free postage and packaging for the UK included.

Brighton Works shunter in August 1946, gaining the new service stock number 377S and Stroudley's 'Improved Engine Green'. The locomotive served as Brighton Works' showpiece from June 1947 and was absorbed into British Railways' stock from January 1948, however fears that the livery would be reduced to BR Black were unfounded, as DS377 was repainted in a

slightly greener shade of yellow in September 1953. On 12 January 1959 the Terrier was transferred from Service Stock to the Motive Power Department at Brighton Works and was given the new number of 32635, which it carried until withdrawal on 30 March 1963.

DAPOL

Dapol are producing a newly tooled model of the Class 43xx Mogul 2-6-0 in OO gauge. This new model will cover the locomotive across its lifespan, with a total of six variations covering a selection of GWR and British Railways colour schemes. Models are expected to arrive in stock by September 2020.

Designed by Churchward for mixed traffic duties, a total of 342 'Moguls' were produced for the GWR between 1911 and 1932. The design was essentially an amalgamation of tried and tested parts from other locomotives, including the outside cylinders of the Saint class, the wheels from the 31xx tank engines and the superheated No.4 boiler. The locomotives proved to be very reliable, so much so that Churchward's successor Collett produced further batches. Two examples can still be seen to this day at the Didcot Railway

Centre and Severn Valley Railway respectively. Dapol's Mogul will feature:





If thinning is desired of any military paint Tru-Color Paint produces, we recommend using our TCP-015: Thinner, at 10%-20% (maximum) concentration. For hot (>900 F) or humid areas, we

recommend adding TCP-310: Retarder to the paint to slowdown drying time. If spraying of any of the brushable colors is intended, we recommend up to a maximum
