


#### THINGS WE'RE DOING

# **Greenbrier 110-ton flatcar is an all-new HO model coming from Walthers Proto**



HO — Walthers will add an 89-foot Greenbrier TTX flatcar to the hobby manufacturer's Proto series. Planned to ship this summer, the newly tooled model reproduces a North American prototype seen on the rails since 2018. The flatcar can handle heavy military vehicles and containers (two 40-footers or four 20-footers). Details and features will include dual tie-down chain channels on the deck, positionable container pedestals, separately applied cable straps and brackets, and factory-installed wire grab irons. The die-cast underframe will possess full, separately applied brake and air rigging. The fully assembled Walthers Proto 89-foot Greenbrier TTX 110-ton flatcar model will ride on 36-inch metal wheels mounted in accurate roller bearing truck

sideframes. The decorated offerings (illustrations shown below) include TTX-TPDX (military use), TTX-XTTX, TTX-JTTX, TTX-PTTX, and TTX-TPDX. The model carries a \$64.98 suggested retail price. In addition to decorated models, Walthers will offer an undecorated version of this all-new model.

### **Canadian Pacific H1-Class Hudson** arriving soon in HO from Rapido Trains

HO - Rapido Trains' new Canadian Pacific Hudson 4-6-4 steam locomotive model is based on the company's "Royal Hudson" release. Fitted with ditch lights on her front pilot, 2816 (shown at right) is a contemporary excursion service locomotive restored in 1998, and this 2816 model will come with an oil tender. Other H1-Class Hudson models will include coal tenders, and variations to the locomotive will include early or late walkways along the boiler with select releases coming with smoke deflectors. Several Canadian Pacific paint schemes are included for this highly detailed, operating replica. The ready-to-run or display HO-scale Rapido Trains Canadian Pacific Hudson steam locomotive will be offered in silent DC (\$599.95) and with DCC and sound (\$699.95). ### First production HO-scale GP16 model nears delivery from InterMountain Railway Co.





**HO** – These are only a portion of the road names due in the first production of an HO-scale GP16 diesel locomotive from InterMountain Railway Co. This four-axle locomotive was Seaboard Coast Line's effort to rebuild first-generation Electro-Motive Division Geeps (GP7, GP9, and

GP18). The program commenced in 1979 and by late 1982 there were more than 150 examples of GP16s in service. Following their Seaboard (and later CSX) careers, these units have gone on to work for various short line roads.

This 1:87 effort follows Inter-Mountain's prior Paducah Geep

rebuild (see "InterMountain Railway's All-New HO GP10" article in June 2017's Model Railroad News). The standard DC GP16 retails for \$229.95, while DCC-sound models list for \$319.95. This offering will come fully assembled and ready to run.







### **EMD SD38 returning from Athearn in early 2025** with DCC-sound and sound-ready DC models

**HO** – Athearn will include speakers in its coming production of HO-scale SD38 diesel locomotive standard DC models (MSRP: \$169.99). LED lighting will be included for all models in this release, with functional roof beacons and ditch lights where appropriate. You'll also find SD38s coming with DCC and SoundTraxx's Econami audio (MSRP: \$239.99). General Motors' Electro-Motive Division built more than 100 SD38s between 1967 and 1971. The major U.S. buyer was Penn Central with 35 units; from this roster Athearn will offer Conrail repaints, post-Conrail units painted for Norfolk Southern, still newer ex-PC units in Cargill service, and a GATX Locomotive Group lease unit (a Primed For Grime release carrying a \$10 premium over the price of regular HO SD38 models).



## Phase II and III GP9s in spring 2024 delivery from Walthers Proto

**HO** – Walthers announces a new production of HO-scale Electro-Motive Division (EMD) GP9 diesel locomotive models, which are due to arrive at your hobby dealer in the spring. The detailed reproductions will present Phase II and Phase III spotting features, plus a range of road-accurate attributes. The popular GP9 came to North American railroading in the mid-1950s and examples can still be found at work today. This run's offerings are Boston & Maine, Grand Trunk Western, Illinois Central, The Milwaukee Road, Norfolk & Western, and Pennsylvania Railroad. The road names will come in two road numbers for models equipped with DCC and ESU LokSound 5 audio and two numbers for the DCC-ready (21-pin socket) standard DC model. The model will include wire grab irons and photo-etched lift rings, in addition to (accurate for each road name) air horn, antenna, and other details on the plastic body shell. The model will include a die-cast underframe with body-mounted metal Proto MAX knuckle couplers. An undecorated GP9 will be available in limited quantities, this release will include dynamic brake and non-dynamic section for the long hood, 48-inch fans, and 1,600-gallon fuel tank. 







The first boxcar release from Class One Model Works is a highly detailed reproduction of Thrall's big and tall auto parts carrier. This 86-foot high-cube boxcar debuts with a wide selection of road names and two distinct body styles: four-door and eight-door.

These excess-height boxcars were developed in the 1960s and first saw service on North American rails in handling auto parts. Several famous freight car manufacturers supplied

86-foot high-cube boxcars, with Thrall being a major contributor to this fleet. This Class One Model Works release is the first contemporary tooling to arrive in HO scale for Thrall prototypes. Whether built by Greenville, Pullman-Standard, Thrall, or others, this big boxcar was a classic 1960s freight car and received bright paint schemes with large decorations representing their owner railroads. Production ceased by the mid- to late 1970s; cars you find today (like the well-weathered Grand Trunk shown on page 49) are around a half-century old. Many remain in their designed purpose of transporting vehicle components, while others handle varied cargo like finished home appliances. By the 1978 close of production, more than 11,000 high cubes were roaming the rails. Thrall's contribution to that total was more than 3,500 cars built from 1964 to 1973.

Though a general appearance spans all these 86-foot high cubes, each builder had signature spotting features. For Thrall examples, you can look for a straight sill and indentions on the sides

of the car. Those depressed sections or pockets reside on the side ends where the ladders sit and on the sides of the doors. The depth of variation on these high cubes is immense, and beyond the scope of the space available here. For a survey of Thrall's production, visit Class One Model Works online and you'll find information from noted freight authority James A. Kinkaid. Mr. Kinkaid's information shared there journeys from Type One cars with running boards on the roof through Type Seven.

The models shown are early production samples shared by Class One Model Works with Model Railroad News. The road names on display were given the green light and checked out by the company. I was privileged to see the coming Santa Fe four-door and Southern Pacific eight-door models, but was unable to include them in this review as revisions to various colors were being ordered prior to the start of the regular production. It is interesting to see and learn about the production process and how a manufacturer in





the U.S. works through the challenges of getting details and decoration, from the design and planning stage to production and final release.

This 86-foot big boxcar has been lacking in 1:87 until recent times. For decades, those desiring a plastic model had two options in Athearn's old "blue box" line (see this issue's "From The Archive" on page 94) and nothing else. Class One Model Works brings Thrall four- and eight-door high cubes to market and joins the list that includes an out-of-production Walthers Pullman-Standard reproduction and Tangent Scale Models' Greenville cars.

I find these HO-scale Thrall high cubes to be beautiful renderings of these exciting freight cars. These models look the part and have a solid feel. Tangent set a very high bar with its Greenville high cube, so I was curious to see another contemporary attempt at an 86-footer. I'm pleased to report these Thrall high cubes are excellent.

The models weigh in at a bit more than eight ounces. The body shell and detailed underframe is plastic with a metal weight included inside the replica. There are separate ladders, stirrups steps, tack boards, door

details, coupler cut lever, trainline hose, crossover platform, brake wheel with chain, and more. Beyond the highly detailed reproduction, I find the wood grain detail provided to the tack boards (on doors and ends) especially eye-catching. The application of paint to color the wheel faces is another outstanding feature that will likely become a future standard for high-end HO rolling stock.

I measured coupler height with a Kadee gauge and these models lined up dead-on. Class One Model Works supplies its own metal knuckle coupler that appears to be the size of a scalehead example. The cars ride on metal wheels (which check out to be in proper gauge) with plastic truck sideframes that include rotating bearing caps.

These new Thrall high-cube boxcars are a welcome addition to the HO market and continue to fill a void for these popular 86-foot freight cars. You can purchase models direct from Class One Model Works or via a participating hobby dealer. MRN





Tifty years ago, decades before Alstom and Siemens emerged as the new faces of North American passenger railroading, equipment with European origins was a distinct rarity on this side of the Atlantic. Four years after Amtrak made news by importing its first pair of French turbine-powered trainsets in 1973, another group of European passenger trains arrived in North America, with a somewhat more exotic pedigree. These were a quartet of former Trans Europ Express (TEE) trains built by a Swiss-Dutch partnership in 1957 for deluxe daytime service linking Zurich, Amsterdam, Paris, and other points.

Five such bidirectional four-unit trains were built, with a twin-engine 1,980-hp diesel-electric locomotive at one end (also equipped with a 300-hp head-end-power [HEP] package) and a cab-control car at the other, operating

under names such as *Edelweiss* and *L'Arbalete*. Aimed at business travelers, the air-conditioned, all-first class 114-seat trains included a dining car, a luggage room in the locomotive, and space for time-saving on-board customs clearance. One trainset was wrecked in 1971, and, as electrification of main lines proliferated, the remaining four were retired in 1974.

They crossed the Atlantic in 1977 to begin a new chapter in their careers, acquired for the provincially owned Ontario Northland Railway (ONR) in Canada to launch a new daytime service — the *Northlander* — between Toronto, Timmins, and (in later years) Cochrane, Ont. Ontario's provincial government had considered acquiring either Canadian-built LRC equipment (still in development at the time) or U.S.-built versions of those French turbine trains, but opted for the

surplus *TEE* trains for their combination of luxurious amenities, immediate availability, and bargain price (reportedly \$200,000 per train, which included refurbishing).

ONR's *Northlander* debuted in May 1977, with the trains wearing a variation of the railway's recently introduced yellow and two-tone blue livery and chevron logo, and receiving standard Canadian safety appliances (roof-mounted bells, horn, three-aspect classification lights, ditch lights, and illuminated number boards). The European interior configuration was retained, with a combination of 2+1 coach seating, nine enclosed six-seat compartments, and a 32-seat dining car.

The trains' Dutch Werkspoor diesel locomotives proved problematic when it came to parts supply and winter operation, and in 1979-80 they were replaced with ONR FP7Am locomo-

tives modified to provide HEP and cosmetically blend at their rear ends with the cars' lower roofline. The Northlander operated in this hybrid configuration until 1992, when it was re-equipped with a small fleet of rebuilt former GO Transit commuter cars.

Several HO releases of these trains' TEE configuration have been offered over the years, by Märklin, Trix, Roco, and others, with the happy benefit for Canadian modelers that ONR versions have also been produced. Austrian manufacturer Roco's mid-2021 Northlander rerelease, in DC format, is the subject of this review.

Roco's sleeved-box packaging is impressive, with a color photomontage of the enclosed ONR trainset, a large side-elevation drawing of the locomotive's "Canadianized" nose, and the stylized Northlander name on the sleeve. Inside the 15.75 x 11.75 x 2.25 inch windowed box, a foam insert cradles each car, nested with clear plastic strips for easy lifting. A small parts bag contains two connecting bars (for joining two trainsets, something only rarely done on ONR), along with pre-painted bells, Sinclair-type radio antennas, a threechime air horn, windshield wipers for press-fit mounting, and plugs to fill pilot gaps when those connecting bars are not used. Documentation is limited to a multilingual foldout instruction/ diagram leaflet (English/German/ French), and separate replacement-part sheets (English/German).

First impressions will bring a smile to anyone with personal memories of viewing or riding this distinctive train, enhanced by the relative improbability of it being produced, with considerable attention to detail, in ready-to-run form. This is not merely a repainted version of the European *TEE* prototype, but rather an ONR-specific offering retooled to reflect the exterior changes made prior to the trains' Canadian debut. Per the prototype, both the locomotive and cab-control car in this set are numbered 1981. Because some of the Northlander route ran over Canadian National (CN), the trains were renumbered a few


weeks after their launch to avoid a conflict with CN equipment. Delivered as ONR train 1901, this set became ONR 1981 in June 1977.

Those initial impressions are confirmed by subsequent close examination. Overall, tooling of the locomotive and cars is crisp and evidence of mold slides is minimal. While treatment of the locomotive's rooftop fan and grille openings is perhaps not up to current standards — relying on tooling to create the illusion of fan blades, grille depth, and lift rings, for example, rather than separate metal parts — the overall result is still very effective, and the two largest roof fans are indeed partially see-through.

Representation of underbody equipment on the three cars is minimal, but is not objectionable as, even at a low viewing angle, this space is largely hidden by the cars' deep skirts. Molded inserts accurately reflect each prototype car's continued on page 54

interior configuration (including the diner's kitchen), and are appropriately colored (blue or beige coach seats and red compartment seats) as a starting point for added detailing. All body shells are easily removed by gently spreading the shell above each truck. Car A, coupled to the locomotive, is the compartment car; Car B is the diner (with an 18-seat coach section); and Car C is the cab-control car, equipped with 42 coach seats. Per the prototype, each car is identified with a blue placard in the window beside the boarding doors. In European service, the dining car featured prominent table-top lamps. Although these were removed prior to the Northlander's debut, they remain (unlit) in the model's interior and are readily visible through the large windows. They are easily removed by pulling up and out of a tabletop mounting hole, or by cutting at their base.

Exterior paint and lettering is very good, with sharp color demarcations

and crisp, opaque, and accurately sized and positioned lettering. Comparison with prototype photos of locomotive 1981 shows that the lower-edge curve of the model's light blue band is too angular; the corresponding curve on the cab-control car is accurate. Five-color renderings of Ontario's provincial flag appear on both sides of cars A and B, and all were printed in perfect register.

Glazing is flush and clear, with the prototype's metal sashes and window frames represented by finely and uniformly applied silver paint. Although venetian blinds used in all the prototypes' passenger windows are absent, several aftermarket options are available to create this distinctive effect.

LED lighting is bright and directional, but with a red aspect on the trailing end that is incorrect for ONR. Number boards are lit, but the three-aspect classlight clusters on the locomotive and cab car are not, and instead have painted lenses. No headlight glow-through is evident, although some stray light reaches the track behind the locomo-

tive and cab-car pilot. Roco offers an optional interior lighting package for this trainset, as part number 40420.

Roco set 72066 (the subject of this review) is DC/silent. Set 72067 is DCC/ Sound. A 5-pole motor and flywheel provide smooth and quiet operation. An 8-pin socket is provided for an aftermarket DCC/sound upgrade. All six locomotive axles are powered, and the outboard wheelset on each locomotive truck is fitted with traction tires, per European practice. Floating (geared) center axles can move laterally to accommodate tight curves; the minimum recommended radius is 16.5 inches (419 mm). Sideframe-mounted steps are a non-prototypical compromise to allow unimpeded swivel of the locomotive's long-wheelbase trucks at this radius. Otherwise, sideframe molding is crisp, with factory-applied separate brake cylinders. Current-conducting coupler bars throughout the train mate easily and securely, and allow power to be drawn from the front of the train in either direction. Spring-loaded,


flat-faced molded black pads between the cars adequately replicate the prototype's fabric-shrouded car-to-car connections while permitting reliable operation of the models on tight curves.

The cars' trucks roll smoothly, although a bit stiffly, out of the box. Flanges are the deeper profile common on European models, but run without problems on Code 83 track, turnouts, and crossings. The train's coupled length is 43.98 inches (1117 mm) over buffers.

Out of the box, Roco's rerelease of the HO Northlander is an impressive rendition of this distinctive train, with considerable attention to detail in accurately reproducing its as-delivered Canadian exterior features and livery. MRN

Rapido Trains offers a common sight in contemporary North American railroading with its HO-scale plastic rendering of FreightCar America's AutoFlood III coal hopper. This model reproduces the 4,200-cubic-foot prototype. This hopper is a rapid-discharge design with multiple outlet gates on its underside that are worked remotely by



an air-controlled system that opens and closes them. The highly detailed replica retails for a bit less than \$60 and comes in single-car offerings and in 6-pack sets (retailing for \$350.70).

This model, like other Rapido Trains efforts, comes fully assembled and features fine details separately applied all around the plastic body. The car rides on 36-inch metal wheels and

comes equipped with Rapido's own design metal knuckle couplers. Across the examples examined for this review, I encountered no damaged or apparent missing parts. The build quality and decoration were excellent on these AutoFlood III coal hopers. The models performed great around a mix of roadbed-track systems with curves of 22- to 24-inch radius.

On the car's A-end, you'll find an air reservoir tank that powers the rapid discharge gate mechanism (reproduced on the model as a round cylinder in the center of the A-end) with piping connecting to a small box (actuator) that aids in the control of the outlets.







The B-end details (a combination of plastic and wire components) include the brake reservoir, cylinder, and triple value, all linked by piping. The plastic body shell authentically presents the exterior-post sides with rivet detail that includes the horizontal band of rivets down a bit from the top edge of the hopper. On the ends of the hopper, you'll find two separately applied hoses... one is the trainline hose and the other is the air hose for supplying the car's gate system. The underbody includes door stiffeners on the gates, and piping running around the outlets on one side of the car as per prototype. The interior bay has rivet detail on the sides and slope sheets. The car's end slopes and underbody are a zinc alloy that supplies the hopper with ample weight (measured at 6 ounces). The model comes with a black-molded coal load. In the contents of the box, I was puzzled, initially, by the inclusion of the magnet wand, but it serves as your helper for removing the coal load that includes a metal plate on its underside... a smart design feature! The texture of the coal load and its rounded end replicate the appearance of the prototype well. My understanding is coal is poured into these hoppers and this creates the smooth, peakless top.

This freight car model comes to Rapido Trains' line with a great amount of research and effort by the company's Matt Gentry. park with this HO-scale AutoFlood III coal hopper replica. This is a stunner and takes this rapid-discharge, aluminum freight car prototype to new heights in 1:87.

This first production provides wedge-logo BNSF, CEFX (CIT Equipment Finance Corporation), GLFX (Gulf Power Co.), GGPX (General American/ GATX leasing), KPLX (Koppel, Inc.),

PGNX (Carolina Power & Light), and Union Pacific (with CMO reporting marks). As these hoppers generally travel in long strings in unit service, I believe you'll find them working in a loop from a mine to power plant. For example, Koppel/KPLX is based in Western Kansas and these cars may circle between Wyoming's Power River region and plants in Kansas.


For those pursuing contemporary era North American railroading, this is an awesome addition to the market. These 4,200-cubic-foot hoppers have been a fixture in unit coal trains for two decades (this style car entered service in 2004). A second production is coming (see information below). This AutoFlood III is also offered in N scale by Rapido Trains. MRN

#### **Coming from Rapido Trains**

A second production of HO-scale AutoFlood III coal hoppers is due in the near future from Rapido Trains. This group will include the road names and paint schemes shown below. BNSF's early look circlecross and Union Pacific with "Building America"

slogan and small shield herald represent the two U.S. railroads in this coming run. Also in this production are DKPX (North Carolina's Duke Power Company), GACX (General American), NDYX (Dresser Leasing Corporation/First Union Rail),

TVAX (Tennessee Valley Authority), and TXUX (TXU Electric). This production will come with multiple road numbers for each decoration, with hopper car models sold singly (\$59.95) and in 6-pack sets



## **Ribs and Roof Hatches**

new model can easily get by even the ardent model train enthusiast, especially with the near-constant flow of new products in the market. This was my experience with InterMountain Railway's new variant of its Milwaukee Road-prototype boxcar model in HO scale. This spent-grain variant was announced some time ago and I had forgotten


about it, so it was a welcome sight when it arrived. This HO reproduction is based on the manufacturer's previously offered rib-side boxcar that was a signature member of The Milwaukee Road's rolling stock roster. This version is a 40-foot freight car, and the railroad also owned 50-foot versions with horizontal ribs. Like many other fine examples in InterMountain Railway's

catalog, this is a well-built and wellappointed rendering. The plastic body includes many separately applied features, body-mounted metal knuckle couplers, and excellent performing 33-inch metal wheels. What is novel in this production is the version of the car with round hatches on its roof and a uniquely decorated sliding door. The prototype received the modification for service at Milwaukee-area breweries moving spent grain left over in the beer making process.

With its Miller Beer outlined logo it as a ready-made HO offering. The model lists for \$42.95 and multiple road numbers are included in this run. MBN

## Low-Nose Landmark

### from Rapido Trains

apido Trains includes a variety of production phases in its debut release of HO-scale General Electric (GE) U25B diesel locomotives. In January's Model Railroad News, you saw coverage of the early high-hood U25B models, and this review shares low-nose examples decorated for Erie Lackawanna (EL) and Santa Fe. Rapido Trains supplied the DCC-sound EL and I had to have an as-delivered "bookends" or "pinstripe" scheme Santa Fe, which I bought from New York's TrainWorld (trainworld.com).

#### **Testbed Road**

Erie Railroad (just a few years before its merger with Delaware, Lackawanna & Western that formed Erie Lackawanna in 1960) served as a testbed road for GE's forerunner UM-series cab units (the other road was Union Pacific). When the U25B launched, the new Erie Lackawanna did not immediately purchase this new GE offering. The road's second-generation start is credited to a 1963 order with Alco for Century 424s (according to Larry De Young's article on EL U25Bs in a 1997 edition of Diesel Era). In 1964, EL ordered a dozen U25Bs (2501-2512). This GE order came with a similar buy for GP35s from Electro-Motive Division (EMD). This sampling of every maker was not uncommon at the time. Also, EL was struggling financially and may have been prospecting with multiple manufacturers to see who could help get financing through for the road. The road's livery was black with yellow prior to the onslaught of four-axle locomotives from Alco, EMD, and GE. The attractive mix of yellow body with maroon band striped in yellow was first seen in these early 1960s locomotives. Rapido's decoration is a slightly later






look with the as-delivered units featuring the road's name on the long hood in maroon above the maroon band. Later, this presentation was revised for a much more visible yellow road name centered in the maroon band on the long hood. Rapido offers four road numbers for this EL look: 2501, 2503, 2506, and 2511.

#### **Bookends Boat**

Santa Fe was among the early buyers of GE's U25B, though they missed receiving high-nose Phase I examples. This model represents one of four road numbers (1609, 1610, 1612, and 1613) offered in this production. I'll not argue against the beauty of Santa Fe's famous Warbonnet, but I do favor this earlier blue with yellow look. The model includes a can-type antenna on the cab roof with air horn cluster centered on the long hood roof behind the cab. I believe the longer raised platform on the long hood walkway is unique to these Santa Fe U25Bs and was a toolbox option GE offered. The longer walkway is spotted not only by its extended length but also by its additional (third) stanchion. As with the EL sample, I find the paint and lettering



and mechanism with the high-hood U25B reviewed in January's MRN. The model is sound-ready in its standard DC edition, with the speakers present under the rectangular black baffle.

are exceptional on this Santa Fe release. Build quality was impeccable on both samples.

I evaluated Rapido's ESU LokSound V5-equipped U25B in January's MRN, and will focus on the standard DC model in this review. I tested the model using a DC power supply unit that includes amp and volt meters and you'll see the performance was great. The drive was very quiet and the locomotive was a great runner with smooth starts and stops. I was pleased to see that under DC power, you receive not only the expected headlight and number board illumination, but functional class lights and ground light over the lead truck on the fireman's side. All wheels were in gauge and coupler height was fine.

#### **Conclusion**

A model has my attention when I complete a review and then go looking to see what other road names/paint schemes are available to buy. This Rapido Trains HO-scale U25B release is that type of offering! The other low-nose U25B road names are Great Northern in the road's simplified Empire Builder green and orange, a black New Haven with McGinnis lettering and white stripes, and two looks for Penn Central: one with a large "PC" and the road's name on the long hood (2662 and 2669) and the other look (2664 and 2667) shows only the road name on the long hood. There are more road names and variants coming, but don't miss a sample for your collection from this first run. MRN

Rivarossi delivers a new production of its HO-scale 50-foot boxcar model. This group shows the versatile style of both the prototypes and this plastic replica with different door and roof options. There are five road names in this release and each includes three road numbers. This Rivarossi model, distributed by Horny Hobbies, was produced in China and comes fully decorated and ready to run. The suggested retail price, \$32.99, makes this one of the most economical freight car models on the HO market.

This model was the first new-tooling freight car to come to the famous Rivarossi brand name in the 21st century. The design goal of this boxcar was shared with MODEL RAILROAD NEWS during the development process just over five years ago. The idea was to tool

up a plastic boxcar model that could be sold assembled, offer some variations to its appearance, and provide hobbyists with a low-cost option for this common North American example. I found the model successfully hit its goals in a January 2017 review of the first production.

This collection is the third run for this HO boxcar model, and I find this effort succeeds well again with five interesting road names and a mix of features. There is no prototype given by the manufacturer for this boxcar; however, it resembles freight cars produced from the latter part of the 1950s well into and through the 1960s. Though it carries the common 50-foot label, the boxcar measures a bit more than 51 feet to its outer edges (which is accurate). All releases include a vertical

panel with welded seams look to the car sides and a diagonal roof design. The modular tooling design allows for swapping out the 9-foot door opening with either a plug door or sliding door. The roofline comes with a separately applied plastic running board section or presents a modern look with no roofwalks up top. For either roof style, there is a tall ladder molded on each side of the boxcar with two grab irons on the opposite side. The car's B-end includes a high-mounted brake and tall access ladders appear on both ends of this boxcar. The detail is generally very good with the end ladders being the only molded-on feature that might be termed "thick" by a judging eye. The stirrup steps, door detail, and other molded-on features look good to my eyes. The underframe is basic, but is not seen for the most part and not a detraction in my estimation. The car comes with body-mounted plastic knuckle couplers with provided metal trip pin. The roller bearing trucks look good and the blackened 33-inch metal wheels function well and enhance the overall appearance of this release. Both couplers and trucks are secured to the underframe by screws. I found the couplers mated up fine with a height gauge and the wheels checked to be in gauge on the samples reviewed.

The road names cover the look of five railroads from a variety of points across the careers of this style boxcar. The brown Canadian Pacific release includes a red newsprint service emblem and shows an April 1962 build date, though you'll note a wheel check yellow dot marker and multi-panel COTS label which would place it in the late 1970s. This Canadian Pacific offering is typical of what you'll find across this production. This model doesn't set out to be the most detailed and infallibly lettered HO boxcar, but the offering does deliver on being a good-looking boxcar that performs well and is attractively priced. With this in mind and if that fits your desires, Rivarossi's HO-scale 50-foot boxcar is a winner and recommended.

In addition to the mentioned Canadian Pacific, the release includes Burlington Northern, Great Northern, New York Central, and Union Pacific. Check the specs I provided in the gray boxed information section at the opening of this review for more on which road names include what type of door style and whether or not they come with running boards. This is a fine release for its asking price and makes collecting them all easier to consider. MRN

# A New Northeastern Caboose from Rapido Trains

apido Trains delivers its take on a North American railroading classic with the arrival of this HO-scale Northeastern caboose replica. There are many road names available for this model's introduction, including Central Railroad of New Jersey, Conrail, Lehigh & New England, Lehigh Valley, Reading, and Western Maryland. Among these road names, many include more than one decoration style; and, all come in more than one road number. The tooling

collection Rapido created offers two cupola/roof designs, two running board types, two body side styles, three end wall configurations, two step types, and additional road- and era-specific features. This HO caboose comes fully assembled and ready for operation or display. Rapido includes interior detail and illumination for the cabin area. The model rides on one of three truck styles: Andrews, Birdsboro, or Taylor.

This style caboose dates to the 1920s and was a Reading Railroad creation (with steel body) that used a proposed USRA design (which called for wood sides). Reading's roster numbered nearly 300 and many other roads included this style waycar too.

The decoration on this review model reproduces a classic 1970s look with Chessie System markings and Western Maryland (WM) reporting marks. The paint application was excellent

with orange hue highlighting ladders, railings, and grab irons. All caboose releases come with a magnet wand for controlling the lighting; additional parts are provided and vary depending on the road name. This model's parts include lanterns, caps for windows, and additional grab irons. Rapido includes two truck styles in this WM release with the additional pair of trucks (which come prewired) bagged and tucked in with the light wand and additional details.

The model comes equipped with metal knuckle couplers of Rapido's own design. The metal couplers are approximately the size of Kadee's well-known No. 5 examples and easily accessed on the well-detailed




underframe. The model is equipped with smooth-rolling 33-inch metal wheels. In addition to this late-era WM appearance, Rapido Trains offers Western Maryland models in as-delivered dress with a red body and black roof and round herald. There is also a later WM release with brown body and white speed lettering.

This is not the first plastic Northeastern caboose produced for HO, but it is one of the best I've examined. The variation in the tooling enhances each release. The model retails for around \$100, which is in league with contemporary high-end waycar models in HO. MRN








# Many Mill Gondolas

# from Eastern Seaboard Models

astern Seaboard Models brings back its N-scale 65-foot mill gondola with a new production. The tooling is enhanced with an improved coupler pocket design. The brake-wheel version is joined by two new ratchet-brake offerings.

This 1:160 steel gondola replicates a Pennsylvania Railroad (PRR) design introduced in the 1930s. The G26-class was a common piece of Pennsy equipment with more than 1,600 examples built. In addition to appearing on PRR's roster, this 65-foot mill gondola was built for Lehigh Valley and Nor-

folk & Western in similar style cars.

The model's shell is plastic with a die-cast underframe. The samples weigh 0.6 ounces each. The underbody includes air and brake details and the inner sides and bed of the gondola feature rows of rivets. The ends of the gondola are separate and allow for positioning up or dropped down for loads of extended length. The brakes, whether ratchet or wheel type, are

separately applied details and look very good. I had to look twice at the grab irons and ladders, as I at first believed they were separately applied.

This review's PRR 440057 shows a late 1960s appearance with a 1965 service date and ACI label included in the decoration. This model rides on National B-1 style trucks. For its new Norfolk & Western release, Eastern Seaboard presents the road's G3 and G3a classes with two road numbers (70504 with 1940 service date and 70508 with 1952 service date).

This is a limited-production release from Eastern Seaboard Models. You can purchase the company's products from its website or from a participating hobby dealer. This is a solid model that has improved with enhancements to the design and variations to the brake for this new production. MRN



# **New Covered Hopper**

from Atlas

tlas adds another new freight car to its Premier series with the arrival of this three-bay covered hopper in O scale. This is one of the MTH-heritage toolings and for this first Atlas production the freight car reproduction comes in 2-rail and 3-rail versions.

The model follows 1:48 dimensions and authentically reproduces Pullman-Standard's PS2-CD 4,427-cubic-foot covered hopper. This popular 100-ton

freight car was built beginning in 1966 and examples continued to be added to the North American freight car pool in the early 1970s. Pullman-Standard modified the look of its 4427 with this high-side edition that allowed for easier access to the outlet gates on the bottom of the car. This design also improved the unloading of dense materials with a more pronounced slope to the bays.

The model is 121/2 inches in length and weighs a bit more than 17 ounces (2-rail edition). The body is molded plastic with additional plastic features like separate hatches and running boards on the roof. The coupler crossover platform is plastic and both it and the running boards include seethrough grate design. The B-end cage includes the expected tanks and piping for the air and brake appliances, and the plastic brake wheel includes a metal chain hanging from it. As stated, this rendering features scale propor-

tions and Atlas offers two versions, so those operating on 3-rail or and 2-rail O scale have an option. Given the scale appearance, I have to say I favored the 2-rail model, as its trucks and bodymounted coupler added to the realistic look. The paint application was good on both the gray Montana Rail Link (MRL) and tan CSX models. Lettering and details like reflective bands add to the presentation of these models. My friend Jeff Zucker of Spring Creek Model Trains is an MRL guy and he mentioned the gray color is a repaint for these hoppers (originally in the road's dark blue) and helped them stay better looking in service. Also, runover from loading would show on the blue sides more than on this gray version.

In addition to this review's CSX and MRL, the release includes: Burlington Northern (later era green with white lettering), Chicago & Eastern Illinois (gray car with black lettering including buzzsaw herald), Equity Grain (gray with black car with blue and gold Equity logo and TLDX reporting marks), J.W. Flammer Co. (yellow with black and TLDX reporting marks), Red River Valley & Western (Mineral Red with white lettering), and Stetson Chemicals (gray car with black lettering). Each road name in this production includes one road number.

Atlas now rosters more than 20 rolling stock options for this Premier line of O. Visit your hobby dealer or check out Atlas online to see the company's variety of O options and various product levels. MRN



model. The car features a plastic body with added details made of a combination of materials. The 2-rail hopper (right) includes body-mounted knuckle couplers, while the 3-rail car (left) includes working couplers attached to the trucks. The model comes in a cardboard box (below) with the car bagged in clear film and secured in a foam inner tray. The 2-rail covered hopper retails for \$89.95, while the 3-rail edition lists for \$84.95. There are eight road names in this first offering from Atlas O on this Pullman-Standard 4427 hopper.





There's a little kid in every model railroad enthusiast and animated accessories like Menards' Cripple Creek Beam Pump speak directly to that youngster. For the mature modeler, this working oil pump presents a ready-made starting point for an eye-catching addition to your railroad.

The Menards Collectibles series uses the Cripple Creek name for a variety of releases offered in HO (1:87)

and O (1:48) scales, and this working oil pump is a recent addition. Both include plastic gears and a small motor, housed in the steel shed, that can be powered by a 4.5-volt source. As with other Menards Gold Line Collection releases, this animated oil pump comes fully assembled and situated on a decorated based. There are two decorated worker figures included, along with the company's mascot Jack the German Shepherd.

I found both pumps functioned well; and the movement is smooth, steady, and slow with an authentic look to its action. The mechanism is very quiet. The port for connecting a separately sold power supply is available from the underside of the base and from the side of the shed on the surface of the scene. The pump starts up immediately when connected to power. The O-scale pump resides on an 8 by 3 5/8-inch base, while the HO version's base measures 4 5/8 by 3 inches.

At their attractive price points (HO selling for around \$30 and O selling for about \$40), these are solid values and add an interesting accessory to your railroad. This is a limited-edition release and is available now. Don't miss your opportunity to get into the oil business and strike it rich with Menards Collectibles' Cripple Creek Beam Pump. MRN


on's Books delivers the 36th volume for the popular and Limportant Railway Prototype Cyclopedia series. This series began in 1997 and equally serves the prototype railroad enthusiast and those pursuing model railroading.

This new volume's main topic and focus is the improved-version Association of American Railroads (AAR) boxcar. This nearly 400-page book opens with an in-depth presentation reviewing and explaining the improvements


to the then-standard 40-foot boxcar that made up the bulk of North American freight car rosters in the mid-20th century. Across more than 125 pages, you'll read about and see diagrams and prototype pictures, and enjoy reproductions of vintage advertising. These resources illustrate the changes and enhancements that played a role in the development of this version of the common 40-foot sliding door boxcar.

Beginning at page 132, the coverage shifts to a gallery of black & white prototype images showing improved AAR-design 40-foot boxcars. This section surveys railroads alphabetically and includes notes on the variations, when they arrived, and how many examples filled rosters. The last few pages are devoted to a roster listing for this series of boxcars.

The reproduction of diagrams and vintage advertisements, and the wealth














Youngstown 6' Postwar Corrugated Steel Door with Camel Center Roller Lift

The book is handsomely bound and given its length (386 pages) feels solid for a softbound offering. The volume may seem pricey at \$90, but remember it is at least the length of approximately four of the older volumes, making this new volume an excellent value.


This Railway Prototype Cyclopedia 36 is at least the second edition to be issued by Ron's Books. I'm thankful the Rosenbergs (Ron's Books owners) have taken up the charge on this series and its good to see Patrick C. Wider (who has authored these volumes since the beginning) involved in this release. 
Above: The 40-foot boxcar, in all its incarnations, is my favorite type of rolling stock. I was especially intrigued to see several late-era examples built around 1960... at a time when this North American standard was quickly being replaced by larger boxcars and the wide range of specialty freight cars introduced in the 1950s and 1960s. Chicago, Burlington & Quincy 19724 was one of 50 modern-looking 40-footers added to the roster in September 1961.



The first plastic HO-scale highcube boxcar models came from Athearn in 1969. The company reproduced an eight-door (Illinois Central above) and four-door (Wabash shown below). The eight-door is close to a Thrall prototype, though the posts showing along the sill are an issue. The Wabash shows as Thrall in its decoration, but the fishbelly sill is more akin to Greenville. These models never got beyond kit offerings.


