'J70' - TOOLING STARTS!

odel Rail/Rapldo's
Project J70 has
passed its first
milestone - the
'sign-off' of the computer design
artwork. Work has started on
making the tools, which is to be
expected to take between six and
eight weeks to complete.

We unveiled the ten liveries in MR237 (see below for a re-cap) and, as we explained, there are some compromises with the tooling. We're not able to reproduce the myriad end door and end window bump-stop positions and styles. Unfortunately, due to the thicknesses of the

materials involved, we're unable to have the windows in the open position. We're pleased, however, to announce that the model will make use of the most up-to-date DCC technology and will sport a Next18 decoder socket.

BACHMANN'S CORELESS RESEARCH

The use of coreless motors in modern ready-to-run models has divided opinion amongst modellers, particularly about their use with feedback controllers. Bachmann pioneered coreless motors in British-outline model locomotives - its 'N' gauge BR '5MT' and WD' 2-8-0 were launched in 2012 - and has therefore decided to investigate whether modellers' concerns are well founded

A Bachmann spokesman told Model Rail. "We ran a number of coreless-motored locomotives for over 100 hours with five-coach trains using a well-known UK manufacturer's hand-held feedback controller. There were no failures and no discernible degradation of performance during the tests.

"We've also had dialogue with the controller manufacturer to discuss the results and to see if there was any other test evidence they were aware of. They confirmed that they were unaware of any motor failures

attributable to the current generation of controllers and motors.

"We are continuing our long-term testing, using different locomotives, trainloads and inclines, but so far all the results have been positive. The indications are that the received historical wisdom, that coreless motors and feedback type controllers are incompatible, would seem to be outdated, and that so long as consumers check the suitability of their controllers, all should be well with our current motor specification."

Bachmann stresses, however, that its initial results are not 100% conclusive and it strongly recommends that owners of feedback controllers contact manufacturers or model railway control specialists before purchasing a new model to discuss their suitability.

Graham Farish's forthcoming SECR 'C' 0-6-0 will make use of a coreless motor.

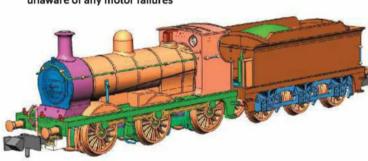

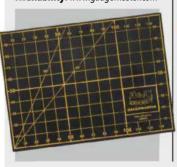

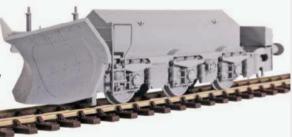

Rapido's 'New Look'

Rapido Trains has announced what it's promised to be "the most detailed 1:76 scale British bus model EVER". The Canadian firm is to produce a Birmingham City Transport 'New Look' Guy Arab IV. BCT introduced the 'New Look' buses, with their radical concealed radiators, in 1950.

Rapido has laser-scanned JOJ 976, a survivor that's based at the Transport Museum, Wythall (www. wythall.org.uk). The model is to have a full multi-coloured interior with no large posts blocking the aisles, separate metal wire handrails and rear platform grab pole, plus steerable front wheels with rubber tyres, and flush glazing. A Deluxe version is promised with working headlamps, interior lighting and illuminated destination blinds.

West Coast Railway Company's rebuilt 'Merchant Navy' No. 35018 British India Line has returned to the main line after full restoration from scrapyard condition in a rather unusual colour scheme - plain black. The last time No. 35018 ran on the main line was 1964, when it carried the more usual BR lined green. The 'MN' also sports the pre-1956 cycling lion emblem and its TOPS number - 98818 - on the cabside.

▼ Ivatt is back

Ivatt '2MT' 2-6-2T No. 41313 has returned to steam at the East Somerset Railway after a restoration from scrapyard condition that took just two years! The ESR completed No. 41313's restoration on behalf of its new owner, the Isle of Wight Steam Railway. No. 41313 had remained in store since it left Barry in 1975. As it had spent fewer than ten years in the yard, it was in reasonable condition and was able to be restored in double-quick time. No. 41313 will return to the island later this year, where it will join classmate No. 41298. It has been fitted with airbrakes for the first time to work the IoSWR's stock. Meanwhile, the IoWSR's third Ivatt '2MT', 2-6-0 No. 46447, will remain at Cranmore.

Great Western Railway is to throw open the doors to its famous Old Oak Common depot on September 2 to celebrate its 111th anniversary. The GWR opened the famous site in 1906 and while few traces of the old steam shed exist, today's GWR promises a treat for Western enthusiasts.

To complement its own fleet of Class 180, HSTs, Class 800, Class 57 and 08, GWR aims to gather classic Western Region traction: confirmed so far are former OOC pilot, '15XX' No. 1501, the Great Western Society's steam railmotor No. 93, five Class 50s and 'Britannia' No. 70013 Oliver Cromwell. It's expected that key GWR locomotive classes, such as 'King', 'Castle' and 'Hall', are due to be confirmed in the coming weeks.

Crossrail's new Class 345 EMUs have now entered revenueearning service between London Liverpool Street and Shenfield. The 66 sets, being built by Bombardier, will eventually work the new Elizabeth Line from Reading and Heathrow in the west, and Shenfield and Abbey Wood in the east. Changes to Rail Safety & Standards Board regulations means that the '345' is the first new train to run without yellow ends since the warning scheme was introduced to new diesel and electric traction in the 1960s.

"It doesn't take much to add realism to a model. Bryan Robertson photographed his Heljan Class 40 on Sir William McAlpine's superb model of Swindon A Shop. I'd added numbers, Shawplan nameplates and lightly weathered it using RailMatch paints. I used Track Dirt, Falcon Grey, Brick Red, Rust and a very fine coat of white to highlight bogie details."



"The workshop's been awash with a sea of 'OO' gauge GBRf Class 66s that I've turned into 66775 HMS Argyll. Most have been presentation models in cases, but I've also done one for Model Rail... see p82.

Dave's Modelling Tip

We all make mistakes. What happens if you've painted a model only to discover that you've forgotten a lamp iron... and to fit it, you have to drill a hole?

This is fraught with problems so start to drill until the bit starts to bite. Then, turn the job through 90° and drill horizontally. I've found that this reduces the amount of bad language used!

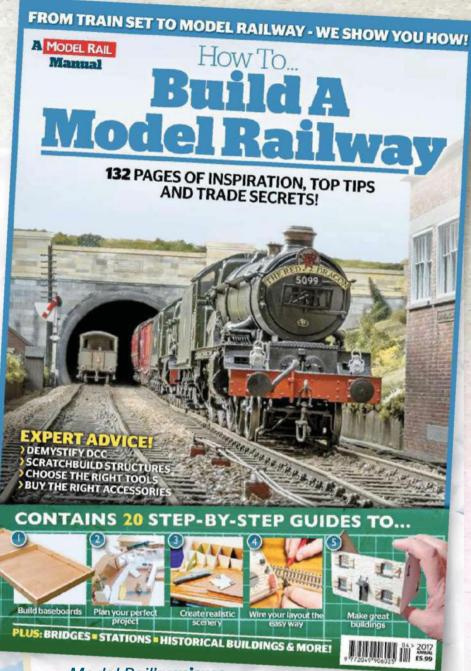

According to Chris...

His grandchildren call him 'Granddad Trains' and he's been a dedicated railway modeller since the 1960s but, despite popular legend, **Chris Leigh** doesn't remember when dinosaurs roamed the Earth!

hese days I get asked an awful lot of questions. Most, though by no means all, are railway-related. Sometimes I'm asked by manufacturers to assist with some aspect of a new product. The late Merl Evans asked me for a photograph of one of the BR Mk 1 BGs that were converted to run with '4-CEPs'. He was contemplating producing a Bachmann model. More recently, I was asked to advise Dapol on the shades of green for the Class 122 railcar. I knew that was an invitation into a minefield, but I believe we got it as close as was possible with the shades available to us.

One recent question really set me thinking, however. "What makes the perfect branch line layout?"

My immediate thought was, "Tetbury, Much Wenlock or Staines West," but then I realised that the answer wasn't as simple as naming a place, it was more about how the layout makes me feel. I think it may be a symptom of advancing years but I can remember these and many more places with a remarkable clarity, while I struggle to remember what I had for breakfast.

My answer was that the layout needed to be a real location, so well modelled that I could get down to eye level and actually be there once again. But take 'Bodmin General' as an example. It's superbly modelled down to every last detail by the North London Group of the P4 Society. Its construction was covered in Model Railway Constructor when Steve Stratten and I were the editorial team. It was as perfect and accurate (to a specific day) as it could be, and yet it always seemed somehow clinical, even sterile, because I didn't know the real place very well and it was set in an era before I was born.

On the other hand, in my mind I can walk through Staines West station and visualise the all-pervading chocolate and cream, the yellowing

walls, and the dark, almost black woodwork. I can hear Alice Tucker yelling after a customer who has forgotten to pick up his change, or gone straight through to the platform without buying a ticket. And then there's that musty, damp smell, where the Wyrardisbury river had seeped into the cellar once again, and the roar of a railcar engine creating a vacuum. How can I get all that into a layout?

MODELLING LIVES

Tales from the world of professional model makers.



This month, prop maker and illustrator **Amy Henwood** explores the roots of her model railway obsession.

'Il be honest, if you'd have told teenage me that at the age of 30 I'd be single, living in the attic of a shared house and building a model railway inside a coffee table, I wouldn't have believed you. But looking back, it almost seems inevitable that that's what I'd be doing. That's the amazing thing about life - you can't predict where it's going to take you.

Five years earlier, at the age of 25, I was made redundant so I decided to leave credit crunch Britain behind and go on an adventure around the world. I wanted to do most of it by train, in memory of my granddad, who had an

infectious enthusiasm for anything rail-related. I also wanted to feel the distance between places, watch landscapes change before my eyes and meet people - real people - not just holidaymakers. It wasn't too long into the trip that I began to understand my granddad's obsession with the railways... and now the obsession was mine: I couldn't shake the connection I felt with train travel.

After returning from my 14-month trip, I landed a job as a prop maker. I had studied animation at university, specialising in stop motion animation, so was ecstatic to finally be making things for a living. After all, I only really feel alive when I'm doing one of two things: making and/or travelling.

As my railway obsession grew I remembered Granddad's model railway, located in a shed at the

bottom of his garden. I'd always marvelled at it, but never considered making my own (maybe because I thought of it as a male hobby, maybe because I didn't have a shed...?). This was a light bulb moment: why not combine the two things I love? Why should I let the fact that I'm a shed-less woman stop me?

Luckily, I had a friend who was also a rail enthusiast (a much more knowledgeable one than me) and he informed me that a single loop of 'N' gauge track could fit inside a coffee table. This was music to my ears... that was the shed problem solved! I could fit a coffee table

between my bed and the wall - and I could even take it with me if I moved (which I did... three times). So I bought a coffee table from a community furniture store, and decided my layout would tell the story of a runaway train during the zombie apocalypse - if it was going to

be a small layout, it was at least going to be a big story! I adored every single aspect of making my railway (OK... maybe the electrics stressed me out a bit/a lot) but I'd have to say the most enjoyable aspect, aside from dressing and painting the layout, has been the community surrounding the hobby. It's blown me away.

As a young-ish woman, I initially felt quite intimidated pursuing such a male-dominated hobby, but I have been greeted with nothing but warmth, inclusion, enthusiasm and genuine connection with fellow railway enthusiasts. It's a hobby that has enriched my life and brought me so much joy. I hope that I can inspire more women and girls into the hobby, and also show people that you don't need a shed, an attic, or permanent space to build a model railway of your own - all you need is imagination.

'Dart Valley Junction' is a stage on which **Eric Austin** can entertain both himself and visitors alike, and it deserves a standing ovation.



'm honestly in awe of every layout I get to cover here in *Model Rail*; the talent that graces our hobby never fails to surprise me. But as someone who prefers model making over play, I've never daydreamed about owning another's layout, until now...

What makes Eric Austin's 'Dart Valley Junction' so special? It's everything a home layout should be: visually appealing, small enough not to take over the house and, above all, fun!

The layout is awash with interactive elements including interior and exterior lighting, sounds, Remarkably, everything is neatly packaged within a modest 8ft by 3ft scenic section.

Unsurprisingly, Eric spent huge amounts of time meticulously planning every inch of the layout to be as visually appealing and fun to operate as possible. But it doesn't stop there. He's constantly upgrading electrics, detailing stock and restoring areas of scenery.

FREEDOM TO CHOOSE

Despite the name, the layout is freelance. This has afforded Eric the opportunity to maintain complete control over the trackplan and scenery. "I didn't actually know there was a Dart Valley Railway [now Dartmouth Steam Railway] until quite recently," says Eric. "I've actually altered some areas of the layout since, to very subtly reflect its namesake."

"I was originally influenced by Paignton station," explains Eric. "But as I have limited space I decided to build something with an essence of the area, and tried to cram in as much detail and playability as possible."

The result is a layout that incorporates a station, engine shed and turntable, alongside all manner of tiny cameos and interesting functions - try a flickering fire and live smoke on for size!

EVERY LAST DETAIL

Eric has quite simply enjoyed his time crafting 'Dart Valley Junction' and that's evident in his inability to put it down.

"It's the sort of layout I hope will never be finished," he admits. "There's always something to do: detailing coaches, adding figures, installing lighting and the like."

Tell-tale indicators of Eric's modelling skill are the Metcalfe buildings that populate the layout. Most modellers can spot a Metcalfe structure a mile off, but Eric has taken the time to subtly modify, super-detail and weather the card-based kits.

"I like Metcalfe buildings very much. I find there's so much you can do with them and they're extremely sturdy." But the detailing goes far beyond the exterior, with many of the structures featuring detailed interiors too.

"I've fitted the signal box with an interior, and the engine shed is fully kitted out; it features a pit with a smoke generator beneath and I've installed a sound system too. It really sounds like a locomotive is being worked on inside. I'm now planning to fit a flashing LED to simulate welding."

Sounds are sourced from YouChoos, with proprietor John Gymer introducing Eric into the world of DCC. "To be honest, I didn't

know that sound, smoke, and digital control existed when I returned to modelling," says Eric. "I like to embrace modern tech and John was really helpful - DCC has opened up a whole new game for me."

ARE YOU NOT ENTERTAINED?

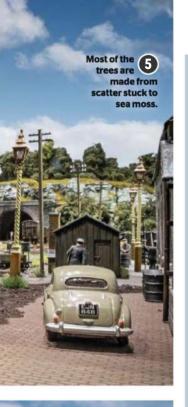
Eric works as a signaller for Network Rail, but he's also a retired member of the Royal Marines Band. It's no wonder presentation means everything to him: "I'm used to entertaining people," he chuckles. "Anyone who comes to visit the layout always wants to come back. I'd like to think that's because they've been entertained.

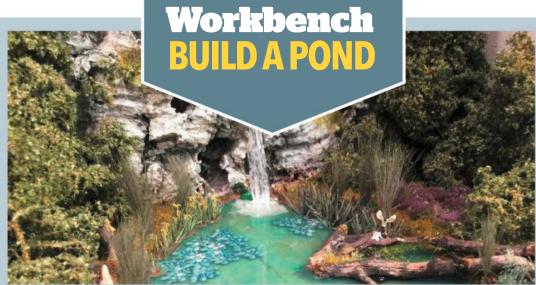
"The sound and smoke - especially the diesels notching up as they pull away - is fantastic. When my grandchildren visit they're mesmerised." Eric's grandchildren are 13 and 21-years of age - so much for the 'yoof' not being interested in the hobby.

Eric is currently refurbishing all of his signals and points and is using DCCconcepts' Cobalt Digital iP Slow Action Point Motors (DCP-CB1DIP). As a signaller, you'd expect Eric to be on point (no pun









'Dart Valley Junction' is always being worked on. To prove it, here's a feature that didn't even exist during our photoshoot. In recent months, Eric has added a pond and a waterfall. Fortunately, he's documented his every move so you can follow these six simple steps and build a stunning water feature too.

If you're adding a water feature to an existing layout, you'll likely need to clear some ground cover first. I used a small chisel to lift scatter material and reveal the baseboard surface below.



Paint the area with various shades of green, I used Humbrol acrylics. If you plan on installing a waterfall, be sure to paint the opening (where the water comes from). I also added a real twig to represent driftwood.



With a dab of cyano glue, attach a sliver of polythene between the opening and pond to create the waterfall. Pour Deluxe Materials' Aqua Magic over the pond and trickle some down the polythene waterfall too.



Before the Aqua Magic cures, add white paint to a cocktail stick and tease out the Aqua Magic to form splashes at the base of the waterfall. While it sets, add reeds and other vegetation around the pond.



I added Noch laser-cut water lilies (14114) to the cured pond surface before applying a second, thin coating of Aqua Magic, to slightly cover the lilies.



To finish, add more vegetation as you see fit. This bird made a nice addition to the scene and was purchased as part of Preiser's Assorted Birds set (10169).

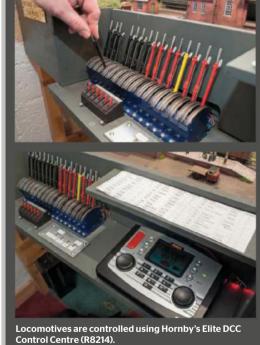




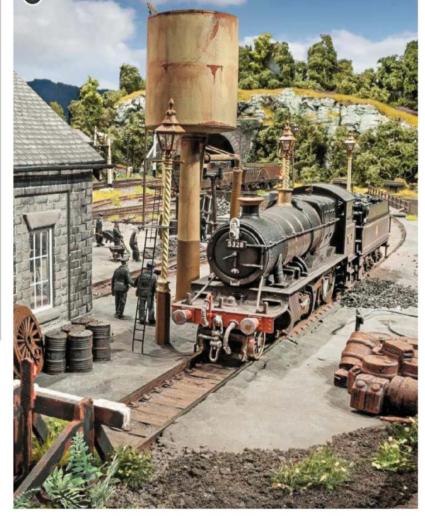








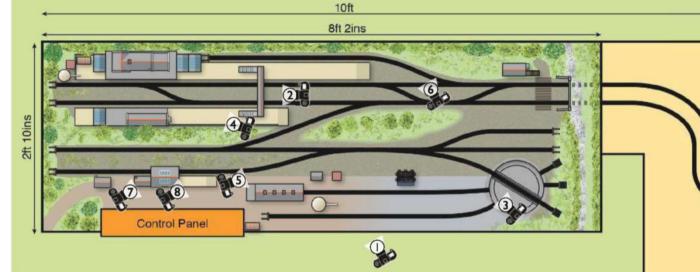
the hobby has come, and maybe even its future. The only negative I can think of is that it's a permanent installation and therefore hidden away from exhibition audiences. But that's not a criticism of the layout, so why is that a down side? Because apart from this layout feature, this is all anyone will ever see of it, and I'm sure a combination of 'Dart Valley Junction' and Eric's inspirational modelling and positive attitude toward DCC has the potential to turn more than a handful of modellers onto digital control - and that might just include me too.





MODELLER CV: ERIC AUSTIN

I started model making when I was about five or six years old, which was over 50 years ago. 'OO' is my favourite scale - I've never ventured into any of the others. I've always been a fan of the GWR, especially when BR took over. I gave up modelling when I joined the Royal Marines, but I got back into it five years ago when I was invited to a function at Britannia Royal Navy College in Dartmouth. I happened to get there early and noticed '42XX' 2-8-0T No. 4277 'Hercules' operating across the River Dart. I arranged to ride behind it and once I arrived and took in the sights, sounds and smells I was hooked again - it's in my blood.



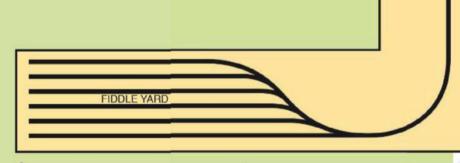
Planning makes perfect

Eric's advice for newcomers is to know your limitations with regard to both finance and space, and to have a clear idea of what you're trying to achieve. 'Dart Valley Junction' was planned very carefully indeed: "I did lots of drawings and really worked out what I wanted to do before I put any track down," says Eric. "I found downloadable track templates to be of particular use."

'Dart Valley Junction's' fiddleyard is accessed via a tunnel scenic break on the right-hand side of the layout. A point merges the two tunnel lines into one,

which wends its way around the perimeter of Eric's railway room (passing his workbench on the way) before finally reaching the fiddleyard.

It's a perfect example of Eric's planning, with every line and curve used to squeeze as much space out of his tiny railway room as possible. He's even got room for a wall-mounted television so he can entertain himself during the most laborious of modelling tasks.

PACER EVOLUTION From Bus To Train

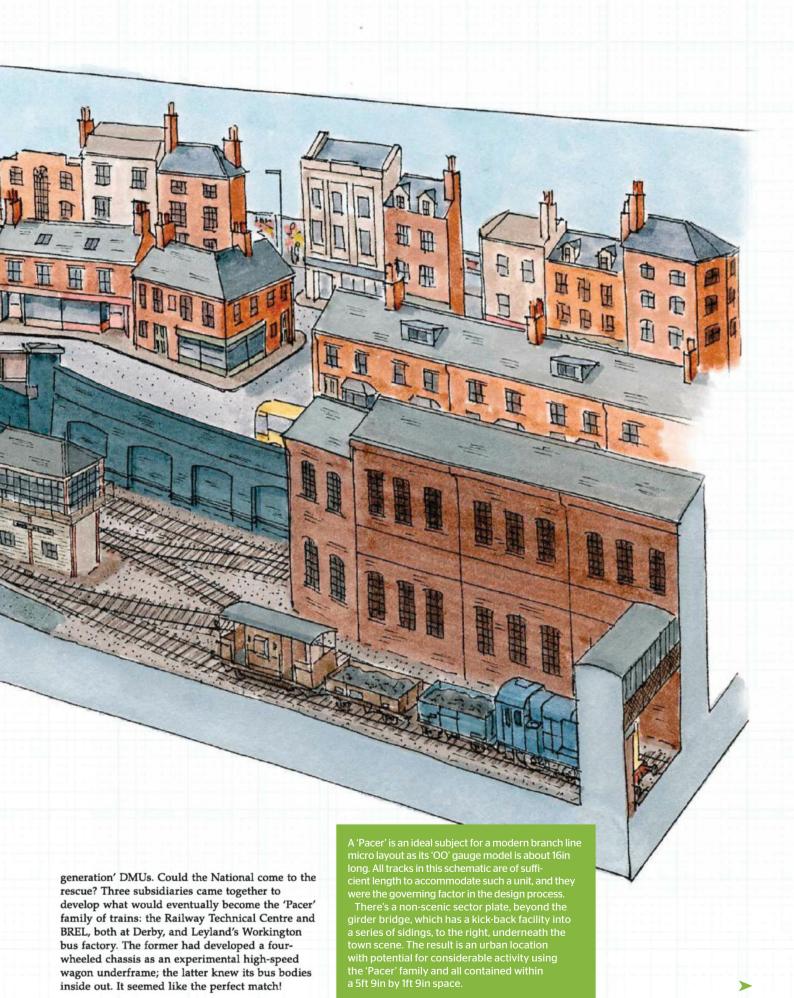
acers' are a bit like Marmite; you either love 'em or you hate 'em. They've nodded their way around the network for nearly 40 years, but their days are now numbered.

They originated when two nationalised conglomerates - British Rail and British Leyland - came together for their mutual benefit. Both had worked together on the ill-fated APT and were

thrown together again in a melting pot of escalating costs, continuing rail closures and uncertain political activity.

British Leyland had built a new factory, in Workington, Cumbria, to build its modular National bus. However, the plant was running well under capacity and alternative uses for National components needed to be found.

BR needed something to replace its 1950s 'first

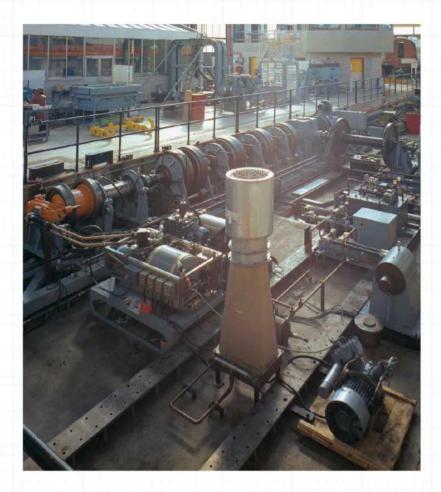

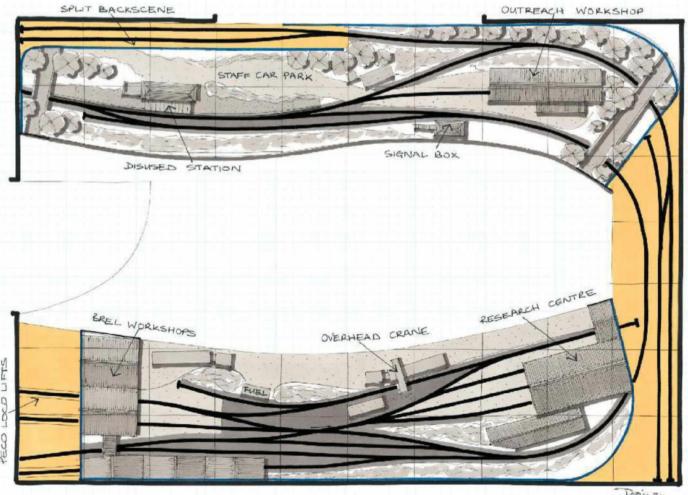
I really wanted a layout on which to operate all 'Pacer' versions and variants. Fewer than ten years separated the build of LEV 1 and the final Class 144s, so I'd be happy to feature all of them on the one layout, although perhaps not the earliest and latest examples at the same time.

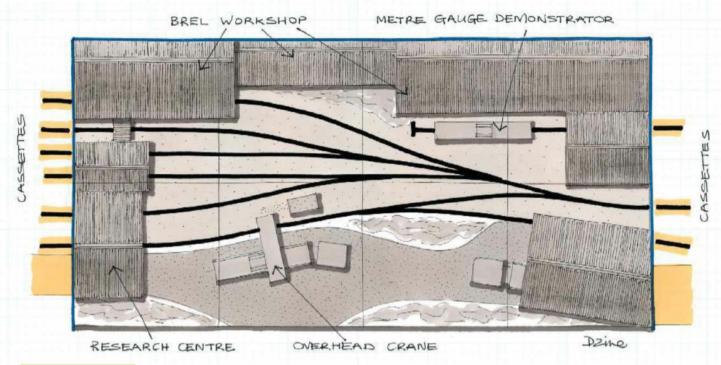
After playing around with a number of ideas, I decided that the focus would be the Derby research centre, complemented by a modest test track and main line connection. This allowed me to run other test vehicles to increase operational interest.

RealTrack Models' new products make this primarily a 'OO' gauge layout, but with Dapol's 'N' gauge Class 142 under development, a 2mm:1ft scale version would also be possible.

British Rail Research Division was formed in 1964, and it moved into the purpose-built Railway Technical Centre. It brought experience from the pre-nationalisation period and developed into what was recognised throughout the world as a centre of excellence for research into science and technology. Works micro layout

If you're a 'Pacer' purist, you're probably going to want to spend a lot of time putting together your perfect fleet... so you'll want to build a less taxing layout on which to display them. Here is that less taxing layout: a take on the Derby factory and RTC headquarters.

To add extra interest, you could allow the baseboard surface to jut out into the foreground (the technical term is 'oversailing') by 6in or so without framing, and if you use ply it might be possible to feature some lorry movement, using the magnetic principle I described for buses in MR221.

Despite initial hopes to export the 'Pacer' type train, the biggest export deal came in 2000 when 11 Class 141s were sold to Islamic Republic of Iran Railways. A further set went to the Netherlands.

From a modelling point of view, I like the idea of an export model diorama. I'd consider a bodyonly static cameo or, for the adventurous modeller, a reduced-gauge unit on an independent section of temporary metre-gauge track.

British Leyland's monocoque, modular, riveted National single-deck bus was first unveiled at the 1970 Commercial Motor Show. Production commenced in 1972, but a lack of orders forced BL to look for other markets. This Shearings Mk 1 was one of the 11.3m vehicles, identified by its second set of doors. Both have a flatter, less bulbous front end, as opposed to the Mk 2 versions, as seen on LEV 2.

'PACERS' - AN EVALUATION

Despite the skill and knowledge employed by RTC, BREL and BL staff during development, most 'Pacer' variants have been described by staff and passengers alike as appalling; they're difficult to operate, an extremely uncomfortable ride and the early Leyland engines and ancillary equipment were highly unreliable. There has been criticism of the quality of bus components, particularly relating to health and safety and as such, public opinion has never warmed to them.

But before you judge the 'Pacer' too harshly, remember that they came at a time of great financial difficulty. They cost much less than a 'first generation' DMU with half the axles, brakes and so on, filling a gap that might have otherwise lead to closure of numerous branch lines.

It's unfair to judge their role, which was to provide a minor service over short trips, rather than the reality of urban intensity, with some journeys stretching to over 100 miles! There have been considerable improvements and refurbishments over the years, notably the replacement of Leyland engines and drive trains.

Hopefully, the '144e' may go some small way to endearing us to these maligned units. That said, there's no getting away from the fact that they use a four-wheel chassis.

KNOW YOUR NATIONALS

British Leyland and National Bus Company joined forces to produce a standardised bus for NBC's subsidiary companies. BL opened a dedicated factory in Workington to build the modular, rear-engined vehicle, which was distinguished by the roof pod that housed the ventilation equipment.

The National Mk 1 was built between 1972 and 1979. The National 2 emerged in 1979. The nose was modified and incorporated new light arrangements and a grille to cool the front-mounted radiator. The rear lights and engine door were also tweaked.

A total of 7,000 Nationals were built before production ceased in 1985. The factory is now part of Eddie Stobart's Workington depot.

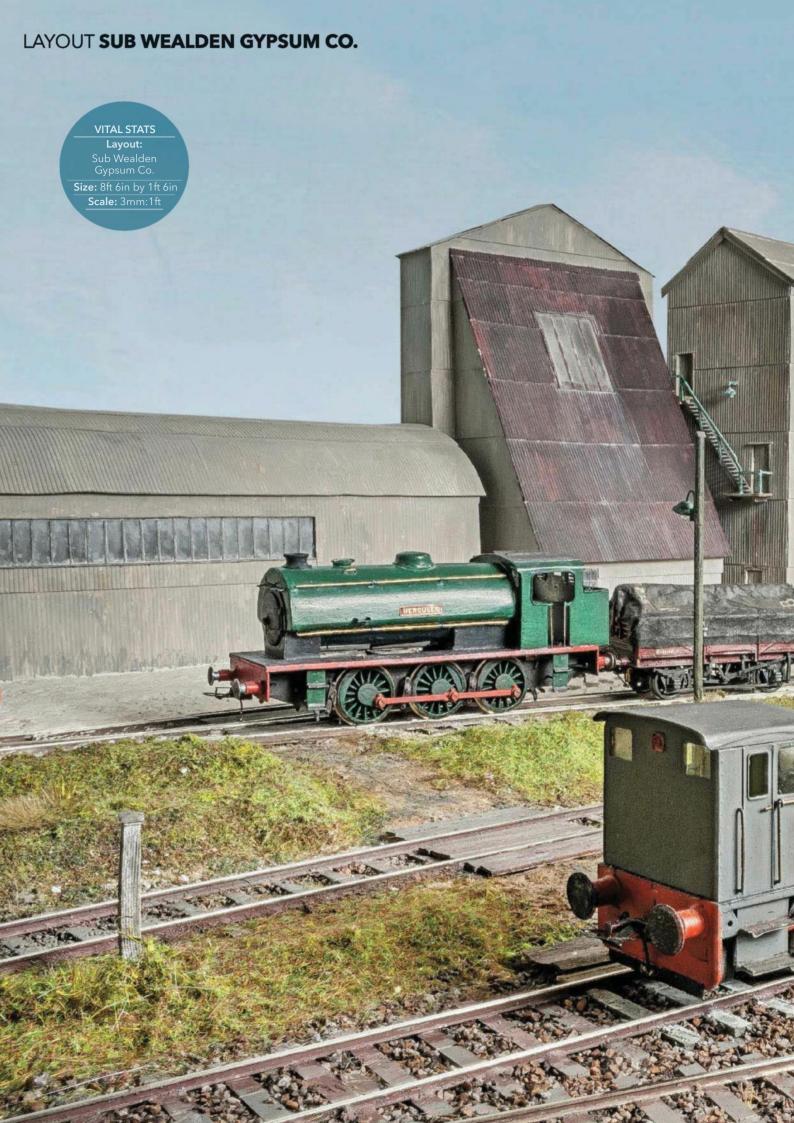

An unusual ALTERIATIVE

3mm often lives in the shadow of other, more recognised modelling scales. But with his passion for kit-building and compact layouts, it's always been **Peter Bossom's** scale of choice.







here's no doubt about it, 'OO' is the most popular gauge for British railway modellers. Meccano ensured its popularity with Hornby-Dublo in 1938 and the hobby hasn't looked back since.

Although there are many reasons why 'OO' gauge is the undisputed king of Britain's model railway industry, it isn't perfect. For one, 'OO' gauge is 16.5mm, which isn't anatomically correct at 1:76 scale - hence the introduction of more accurate 4mm gauges, 'EM' and 'P4'. Secondly, and this goes for all 4mm disciplines, it's still relatively large. A 'OO' Class 37 and four Mk 2s, for example, are over a metre in length (over 3ft); that will take a big chunk from even a 6ft long baseboard. The obvious alternative is 'N' gauge, which boasts considerable space benefits alongside a formidable roster of ready-to-run locomotives and scenic accessories.

But if the prospect of kit-built and scratchbuilt stock doesn't put you off, there is another, less talked about alternative: 3mm scale. And this is where Peter Bossom's 'Sub Wealden Gypsum Co.' comes in.

FIND YOUR SCALE

Peter models to a gauge of 14.2mm, which is the 3mm equivalent of 'P4' - the most anatomically accurate gauge in 4mm scale. He cut his modelling teeth on Hornby-Dublo, but not for long...

"Long ago, when I was very small, it allowed me to fit a better layout in my dad's shed," Peter explains. "3mm offered me the opportunity to have a slightly better layout within the space I had to work with and I've stuck with it."

He notes that the differences between 4mm and 3mm scale aren't huge, but the latter allows for slightly tighter curves that are easier to incorporate into a small area. Peter also enjoys building his own stock and track, and is happy that he doesn't have to compete with an increasingly realistic ready-to-run market.

"I just like the scale," he chuckles. "What I build stands on its own merit. It doesn't matter how badly I model a locomotive, I know I won't get upstaged by Bachmann or Hornby two days later!"

Peter insists that with practice, working in 3mm becomes second nature: "The scale is virtually 1:100, which happens to be an architectural scale it's why everything looks right. After a while, certain processes become automatic. For example, I know off the top of my head that a 6ft 6in by 3ft door will be 19.5mm by 9mm."

VIEW BLOCKED

The model is based on the Mountfield Mines, Battle, East Sussex but is in no way prototypically accurate. This wasn't for lack of trying: "I thought I could just phone the site manager and I'd be allowed to visit the prototype," says Peter. "But they wouldn't play ball - perhaps it's actually a secret Government installation," he laughs.

The result is a freelance layout with >

What makes this layout great?



I love ready-to-run locomotives as much as the next person, but there's something truly magical about a layout that features kit-built and scratchbuilt stock. Sure, it'll never look quite as a good as Bachmann, Hornby, or Dapol's latest and greatest, but a slightly imperfect home-build has a charm all of its own. That's the key word here, 'charm', and it's something that Peter's layout has by the bucket-load.

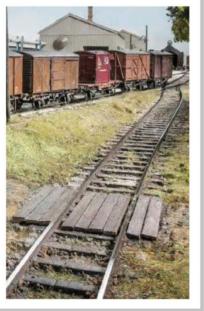


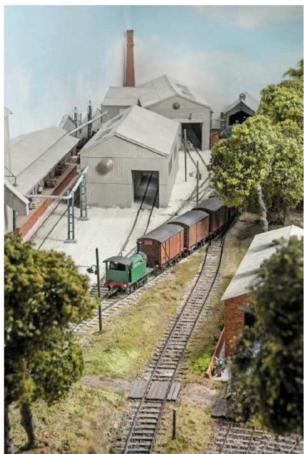

a purpose, and that's fine by Peter. He explains: "I usually try to build something that's based on a real place. All my layouts have a semblance of truth. It gives me a location that I can build upon - but it's really an excuse to tell fairy stories!

"The real site is set within a clearing and surrounded by woodland. "I want the viewer to feel like he or she is standing in the woods."

This has been achieved via the use of view blockers, which Peter discovered from the writings of micro modelling maestro Iain Rice.

"The idea is that you're often standing directly in front of a copse of trees," explains Peter. "Which obstructs your view. This means you actually have to move about the layout and look around the trees to see the stock and buildings - just like the real world."

Each tree is scratchbuilt using a wire armature (see page 47 for more information). But it's the ground cover that's really interesting. At the foot of each tree is dead grass, weeds, and churned-up soil - exactly what you might observe in the real world. This has been created using Treemendus' Forest Floor mix. Peter also used a range of earthy scatters and flocks to provide extra variation, and even dried coffee grounds, too. "When I'm using scenery I've got five or six bags on the go at any one time. I'll take a pinch from this bag, then that one, trying to stay away from flat, uniform colours."

INTEREST FOR ALL

Peter is very aware that not everyone at a model railway exhibition is interested in railways, which is part of the reason why he spends so much time creating scenery. "Some people accompany their partner or friends to a model railway exhibition and they're not really interested in trains, but they do have an interest in scenery. I like to create interest for everyone."

But the model railway faithful needn't worry, because Peter's got all bases covered. 'Sub Wealden Gypsum Co.' is served by a fleet of over ten locomotives.

"Building industrial locomotives can become a little addictive," he says. "I'll only have two or three >

locomotives on the go at any one time, but I really got into building them."

All of Peter's stock is kit-built with one scratchbuilt creation, an Avonside 0-4-0T named *Agincourt*. This is based on Cadbury Works Railway's *Cadbury No. 1*. The chassis was built by the late Martin Brent, while Peter built the body from plastic card.

Peter isn't a fan of weathering with paints, and prefers pastels instead. He explains: "I bought the pastels from a Dutch company at an exhibition. You simply rub them with a brush to collect powder, which is then brushed onto the locomotive or wagon. One reason I like powders is because if you go wrong you can dust them off and start again."

SITE REFERENCE

Buildings are scratchbuilt, but aren't necessarily based on the prototype.

"I have a reference book, given to me by a relative who used to work on-site, but that's all I had to go on really," admits Peter. "As such, the layout is based on basic industrial buildings. Its main relationship with the prototype is the original name, the nearby road (Hoath Hill), and the woodland setting."

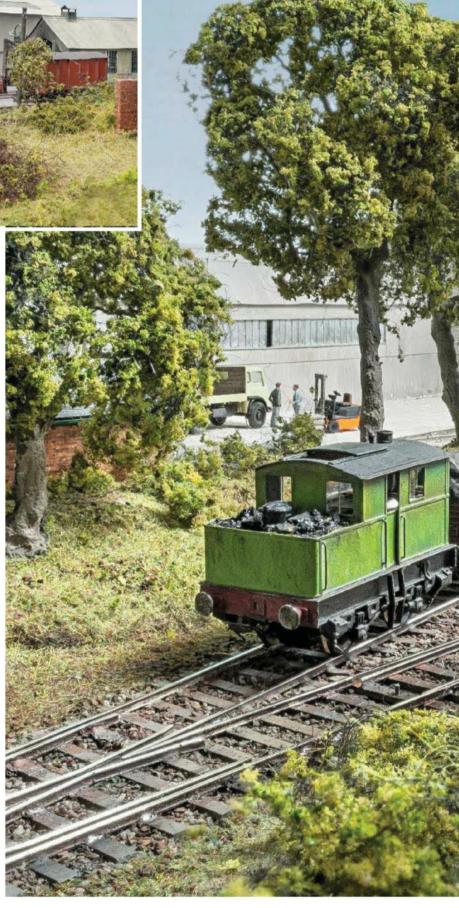
A shell of mount board is covered in Slater's Plastikard. Brick buildings are covered in brick paper and include the works fire station and office.

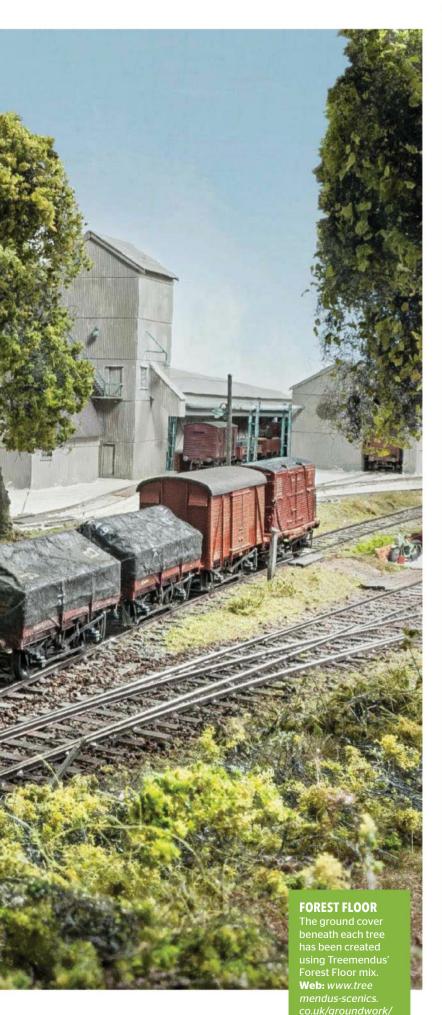
'Sub Wealden Gypsum Co.' is actually in its third incarnation. Peter explains: "The first one was 6ft long and was housed along the chimney breast in the dining room. I wanted to incorporate diesels alongside passenger services, so I expanded it to twice its length.

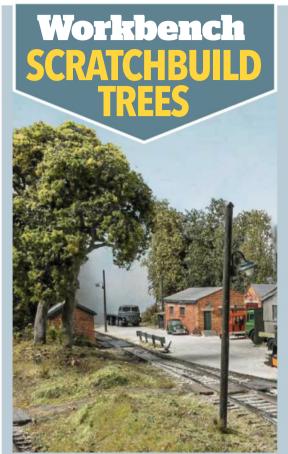
"Although the theory for this second version was good, in practice it didn't really work for me - I'd had enough of walking up and down the layout at shows, so I axed the BR line and added more trees - it's how the layout exists today. I found it far more therapeutic to operate and I'm pretty sure I won't rebuild it again." The layout is now a comfortable size to operate. And with a 6ft long scenic section and a separate 2ft 6in fiddleyard, it's reasonably easy to transport.

'Sub Wealden Gypsum Co.' is a fantastic ambassador for 3mm scale. All gauges have their advantages and disadvantages - 'OO' is certainly in no danger of getting derailed. But if Britain's most popular railway modelling gauge isn't for you and you're comfortable with kit-building and scratchbuilding stock, then why not give 3mm scale a try? Like Peter, you might find it becomes a lifelong passion.

□







With the trees situated so close to the foreground, Peter has spent lots of time and effort to make them as realistic as possible. Each tree is made using a wire armature, with a thick creamy substance brushed on top (plaster, white glue and water). Once hardened, the trunk and branches are painted with a series of earthy browns, greens, and greys. The leaf effect was created using Woodland Scenics poly fibre flock material.

Peter used a pear tree at the bottom of his garden as a reference for the shape of the tree armatures, but didn't base them on any particular species. He's also used another method: hot glue spread over the wire

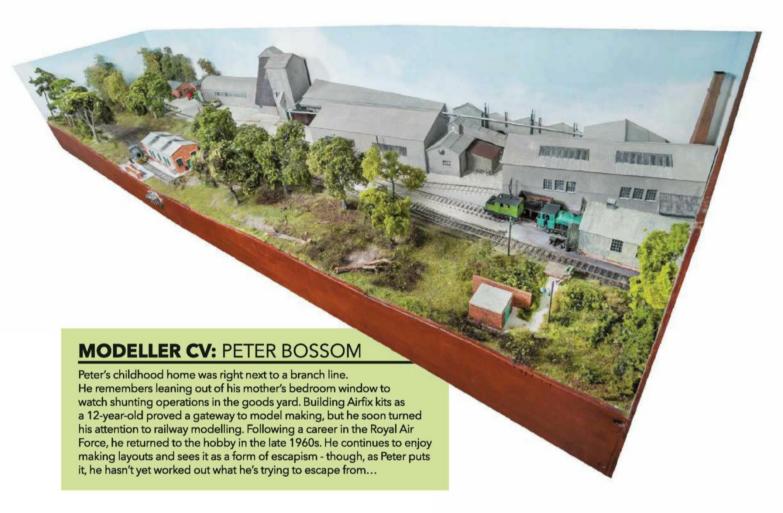
armature to form the bark texture around the trunk and branches. although he notes: "It can be a painful process as excess hot glue tends to drip off the armature and settle on your hand." Caution is very much advised!

10 ways to build a better BRANCH LINE

Don't settle for an 'average' branch - **Richard Foster** offers ideas on producing a branch that stands out from the crowd.

S2 will be Britain's slickest railway; sleek, ultra-modern trains speeding along stylish and dramatic infrastructure. It will cost billions of pounds to complete, but its raison d'être is no different to that, say, of the Stockton & Darlington Railway. It's very simple: a railway stimulates economic growth. Goods can be exported; demand for imports increases; people can communicate more easily; communities can thrive.

The first railways, beyond the industrial lines that spurred railway development in the first place, linked key towns and cities - London and Birmingham, Liverpool and Manchester, London and Bristol, for example. This sparked the Railway Mania of the 1840s, in which every community wanted its own railway. People got rich, some went bankrupt, but that's how the bulk of our national network came about.

Your town or village would suffer if it wasn't connected to

a railway and that's where the rural branch line, the subject of many a popular model, originated. Some were promoted by the railway companies; others were pushed through by wealthy locals. They snaked away from the main line and provided what was hoped to be a lifeline to remote communities.

The Light Railways Act of 1896 provided a further boost for the branch line. Rules were relaxed to enable cheaper railways to be built. This was a boon for very rural areas, which railway promoters had traditionally shunned. It was the final piece in the branch line jigsaw and it created some of the classic imagery and memories that we enjoy to this day.

The branch line is probably the most modelled subject. There are some superb layouts on the exhibition circuit, but it's sometimes easy to slip into familiar ways. Here are ten things to consider when planning your next project that will help you create a branch line with a difference.

1 Avoid the clichés

Ratio's and Wills' plastic kits still look good today, even though they've been around for decades. Their longevity has been their downfall, however, because there was a time when every layout included a provender store, a Highley signal box and a Tetbury locomotive shed.

You can avoid these clichés if you consider the history of your branch line, fictional or not.

Was your branch line built by a small, independent company? If so, such an organisation would offer goods facilities to stimulate local industry, as well as a passenger station. An independent company might supply its own locomotives and rolling stock and would likely provide a shed. However, if the branch was operated by - or built by - a main line company, a shed might not have been required.

A railway would generally have its own architectural style, depending on who built it and whether it had money to spend. Highley signal box, for example, was of a style specific to the Severn Valley Railway Company so it's not suitable for a railway beyond the Shrewsbury-Kidderminster route.

Was there a local industry that your branch was intended to support, or were passengers key? If you compare the Callander & Oban Railway's termini at Ballachulish and Loch Tay, the former was supposed to have supported local slate quarrying and the latter served the tourist trade on the loch.

Ballachulish, therefore, had an extensive goods yard. Loch Tay had a platform with a loop and a siding onto a pier. Coincidentally, neither branch reached the respective levels predicted by its promoters...

2 Avoid BR?

Nearly all branch line layouts you see at exhibitions feature subjects from the 'Big Four', either in pre- or post-nationalisation liveries. How about choosing a non 'Big Four' subject to set you apart from the crowd?

Private or independent railways weren't numerous, but what they lacked in quantity they more than made up for in interest. There was the Derwent Valley Light Railway in Yorkshire, promoted by local councils, that offered a steam service in the 1970s. Or how does the North Sunderland Railway in Northumberland grab you? As well

as the ex-NER 0-4-0Ts it hired, it was one of Britain's first railways to use a diesel locomotive.

If you want a bit more grit with your branch line, there's the Wemyss Private Railway, which linked Fife collieries to the sea at Methill. A big Andrew Barclay 0-6-0T plugging away with a rake of coal wagons offers a nice contrast to a '14XX' and an autocoach!

And don't think that branch line means quiet. Ashington Coal Company, later part of the NCB, provided passenger trains on its internal railway system. These trains ran 24/7, totalling about 100 trains a day.

3 Why not go modern?

There's a romance to the rural branch line, so it's understandable why they're such a popular modelling subject. But the branch line isn't dead and modelling a modern one could be just as rewarding to get right.

Henley-on-Thames station is typical of the modern branch line terminus. It once had a grand entrance building and trainshed, there was a small locomotive shed and turntable and huge spans of carriage sidings as well as the goods yard. All very modellable, for sure, but why not challenge yourself to model it as it is today? There's the single platform face, no pointwork and a simple, if slightly austere, waiting room. The challenge is to accurately recreate the redeveloped railway land - car parks on the old goods yard, housing on the old locomotive shed and the site of the train shed that's now occupied by flats, shops and offices.

Or you could go ultra-modern and model Britain's newest branch line. Tweedbank is the terminus of the Borders Railway, which only opened in 2015. It's a study in modern functionality. It has two tracks astride its island platform, a simple building and, as it's a modern transport interchange, bike

racks, bus stops and good car parking. There's lots of grey steel but it's still shiny steel. Everything looks fresh and new, including that distinctive red ballast and the asphalt. It would make just as attractive a model as Tetbury...

4 Urban or rural?

It's probably the Great Western
Railway's fault that when one thinks of
a branch line, it's the rural by-ways of
Oxfordshire, Wiltshire and Devon that
immediately spring to mind. It's a world
of afternoon tea and friendly villages
where the vicar knows everyone personally. Cricket will be involved somewhere.

It's true that the majority of branch lines crossed open country, but the nation's towns and cities provide a rich canvas for a branch line layout. Some destinations were rural when the line was opened and have been subsequently surrounded by urban sprawl.

The urban branch line offers much potential. Station sites were more cramped, which benefits the space-starved modeller, and the focus was mainly on passenger traffic. Goods facilities were usually quite minimal, but the frequency of passenger

traffic makes operation interesting.

An urban location will make scene setting much easier. Surrounding the layout with buses and signs carrying the London Transport roundel will overtly tell the viewer where the layout is set. A subtler hint could be the style of the retaining wall; the majority of London's railways have brick retaining walls, whereas those in Yorkshire and Lancashire made greater use of stone, such as limestone.

5 Go station-less

A branch line layout will usually mean a chocolate box setting; perfect little station, goods shed and engine shed. All very lovely, yes, but a little predictable.

Picking a branch line without a passenger station is another way to set your layout apart from the crowd.

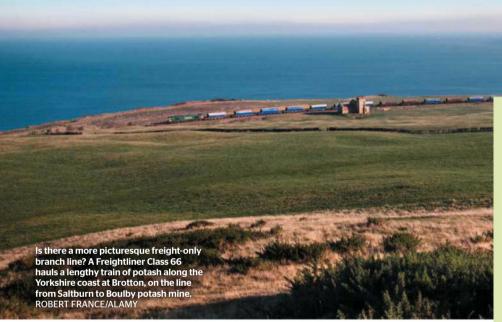
What do we mean by a station-less branch line? Well, one that's freight-only.

The freight-only branch line fits into two broad categories. The most common

today is the former through route - even main line in some cases - that has been cut back to serve an industry. So rather than quaint station, you could model a car factory (ex-Highworth branch), a potash mine (Redcar-Whitby) or even a pet food factory (March-Wisbech).

The other category is the branch that was built for freight. The 1½-mile railway through the Derbyshire countryside, between the Hope Valley line and the giant Hope Cement works is a perfect example. But a freight-only line didn't always mean there's be a specific industry at the end. Sometimes, if the freight traffic was great enough, or the local station sites too cramped, you'd find a 'goods station', an extensive goods yard away from the passenger station. For example, across the River Calder from Dewsbury station was the Midland Railway's Savile Town Goods, fed by its own branch line from Middlestown Junction, south of Dewsbury itself.

Modelling the perfect branch line

For me, the perfect branch line is one running in gorgeous countryside. Short passenger and goods trains are ideal, arguably in pre-nationalisation days, and the Ashburton branch (of course!) springs immediately to mind on a summer day. But a single-car Class 153 on a Cornish branch appeals nearly as much. Bringing it more up to date, a Scottish branch

with Class 37/4 motive power with Mk 2 carriages appeals nearly as much. Today, the Paignton branch offers modern traction plus a steam connection. Lovely."

Prepare to be surprised

It is said that French dictator Napoleon Bonaparte was responsible for the development of the steam locomotive. Prominent industrialists turned to this new technology to replace the shortage of horses caused by war with France.

World events could impact the lowliest of rural British branch lines in the most surprising way. Few realise the role that the Didcot Newbury & Southampton played in D-Day, for example, but the line was heavily upgraded to keep the south coast ports supplied with materiel.

Bacton is the typical GWR branch line station. Set in the gorgeous rolling hills of Herefordshire's Golden Valley, its single platform, small building and goods loop make it eminently modellable.

You'd never expect that this peaceful spot would become a hive of wartime activity. Crates and crates of Allis-Chalmers tractor components were delivered to Bacton, where they were assembled in the open - but later under canvas sheets in the goods yard. Regular branch locomotive '58XX' No. 5818 was put to good use, bringing the crates to Bacton and then pulling away with wagon-loads of completed tractors.

It's proof that even the most unassuming location might reveal some secrets that could make a good model just that little bit better.

Main line or branch line?

This seems like a daft question to ask in a feature about branch lines, but bear with us... Look at Britain's railway map and you'll see a good number of branches. But compare that map with one from the 1920s and you'll see that not all of today's branch lines were, in fact, branch lines.

Take Hadfield station in Derbyshire, for example. It feels like any other modern branch line terminus. There's a single line and a single platform face. The building is no longer used and there are minimal passenger facilities. The encroaching vegetation looks as though it hides some secrets...

Hadfield would make an interesting layout, partly because of its history. It was on one of Britain's most unusual and much-missed main lines, the Manchester-Sheffield-Wath electric railway. This railway was one of Britain's favourites, with its unique 1,500V DC electric locomotives and classic tunnels at remote Woodhead.

Choosing somewhere such as Hadfield gives you the chance to model the MSW, but in a very small space. The catenary portals still survive, albeit with 25kV wires rather than the post-war system, and there's a rusty and redundant signal still standing sentinel over the abandoned trackbed... an intriguing and poignant modelling project.



The perfect branch line

"The perfect branch line layout has to be modelled on a real place and has to be so well modelled that it feels like you're really there. All these places have gone now, and even if they are in the hands of a preservation

group, they aren't the same. I want to be able to put my eyes down to a realistic level and actually feel as if I'm really there at Tetbury or Calne or Staines West, so even the smallest detail is important."

8 Preserved branch line

We all like a railway that gives us the opportunity to run whatever trains we want. We can invent all sorts of spurious histories to justify a particular item of rolling stock running where, arguably, it shouldn't... but why not go for the easiest scenario and model a preserved branch line?

There are so many railways that have been carefully restored to become beautiful timewarps. Bewdley, Weybourne, Oakworth, Horsted Keynes... these are just four where time seems to have stood still.

You can recreate them in miniature using exactly the same products and techniques that you would to model 1950s Watlington. Some buildings have been immortalised in miniature too, thanks to the efforts of Bachmann Scenecraft and Hornby Skaledale.

But rather than invest in a '14XX' and autocoach, you can indulge yourself with LMS and LNER 'Pacifics', Class 50s and Deltics. The 'Royal Train' has visited the Severn Valley, while an HST made it to Oxenhope, terminus of the Keighley & Worth Valley.

The Severn Valley Railway's Bewdley station has been beautifully restored to GWR condition... and now plays host to all manner of traction. BR blue Class 50 50007 Hercules departs for Kidderminster with a rake of GWR stock, as 'Western' D1062 Western Courier awaits its next duty. GARY MOSELEY/ALAMY

"For me, the perfect branch line layout has to transport one into a rose-tinted parallel universe. Sheer accuracy is not important, it's more about atmosphere and taking me to another past world, maybe something akin to The Titfield Thunderbolt. That aside, I don't want something glossy and twee; I want rail tops just poking out of the weeds, peeling paint, rust, decay, neglect - the look of a line that should have closed decades before, but has somehow escaped the chop."



9 Be flexible with time...

BR's Modernisation Policy may have swept away steam power and replaced it with diesel and electric traction, but it took much longer to modernise traditional railway practice. The result was the intriguing image of a big diesel in locations where, previously, small steam locomotives held sway.

Parkend, deep in the Forest of Dean, is the perfect example. Coal kept the ex-Severn & Wye lines open, but rather than ex-GWR panniers picking their way between buildings to access the coal sidings, it was Class 25s and Class 22s.

Later, BR blue Class 37s took on these duties, emphasising even more this bizarre combination of the modern and the old. But it was oh-so-fascinating!

Steam-era signs, colours and infrastructure didn't disappear overnight with the end of steam, so you can model a 'steam era' branch line with all the old-time accessories you want - but keep a few big diesels up your sleeve to surprise and entertain.

10 Go with the imagination

The previous suggestion included a bit of modified history; pulling forward the dates of rationalisation to combine some dereliction with the last remnants of steam haulage. But why not go further?

The possibilities for a 'what-might-havebeen' branch line are as broad as your imagination, but there has to be a grounding in reality, no matter how tenuous.

There were some rather spectacular railway prospectuses issued, although some were too ambitious to ever be con-

sidered viable schemes. But that suits the 'what-might-have-been' in two ways: one, you will probably find a scheme for your chosen location somewhere in the annals of railway history, and if you can't the likelihood is that it would probably have been considered at some point.

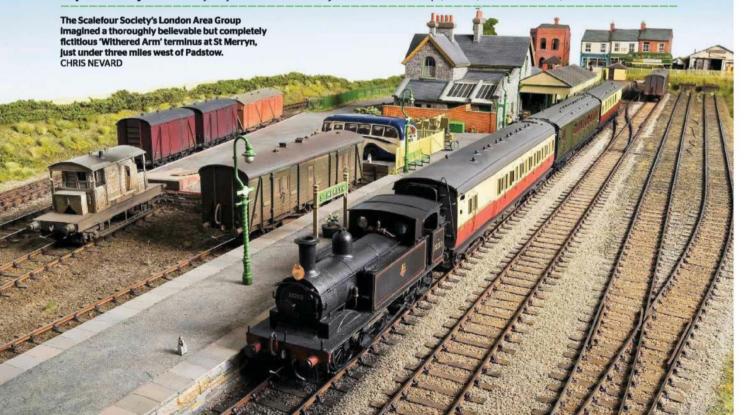
The key to success is to create something believable. Study other similar branch lines to form a picture of what the promoters behind your fictitious scheme might have wanted, if they were real. Base your station on something similar on a real railway, to produce a realistic track plan.

Create some individual architecture, if necessary.

Opting for the 'what-might-have-been' approach enables you to model your favourite parts of the country. It also enables you to imagine running powers' agreements to widen the choice of stock you want to run.

Fictitious branch lines... the possibilities really are endless!

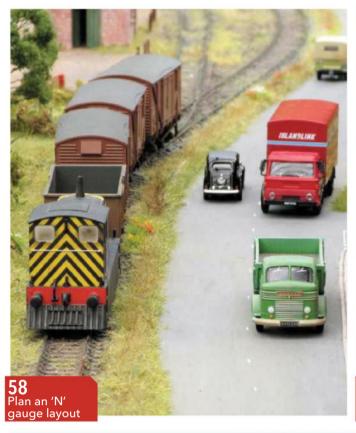

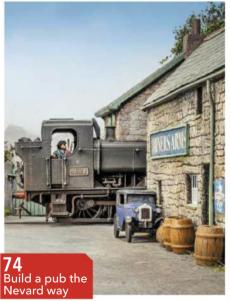

HOW TO

PLAN AN 'N' GAUGE LAYOUT

After perfecting building layouts in 'OO' gauge, **Peter Marriott** sets about designing and making a smaller project - picking the Wisbech & Upwell Tramway as his subject.

ot a set of 4mm:1ft scale drawings and want to make them 'N' gauge? It's easy on a photocopier - just reduce it by 50%. But does building a layout work the same way? Can you simply reduce everything by half?

The last 'N' gauge layout I built was 'Gullant', which appeared in *Model Rail* back in 2013 (doesn't time fly...?). I really wanted to have another go, to make something ultra-realistic, a test bed to see if the time-

honoured techniques I use in 'OO' will transfer to the smaller medium.

Past experience has taught me that it's somewhat more difficult to lay lifelike track in 'N' compared to 'OO'. The depth of the sleepers on some 'N' track systems is visually excessive, so I decided to plump for Peco Code 55, which is slightly finer than Code 80.

The question, as always, was 'which railway shall I model?' It was George Dent's build of the little N Drive Productions 'Y6' O-4-OT

(MR238) that settled the matter - it'd been over five years since I'd last modelled the Wisbech & Upwell (see 'OO' layout in the main image), so the time was ripe for another go.

This project will cover research for the layout, baseboard build, design of the layout, laying the track, making the landscape, making the scenery and, finally, detailing the layout. But first, I need to dig out my reference books and work out which part of this delightful Fenland branch line I'm going to model...

The real railway

The Wisbech & Upwell Tramway was one of Britain's favourite branch lines, even though it was only six miles long and ran through some rather uninspiring scenery, in an area that was not a huge draw to the railway enthusiast.

Its quirky locomotives augmented its appeal, but it was the work of the two railway enthusiast clergymen, Rev Teddy Boston and Rev Wilbert Awdry, that secured the railway a place in the nation's consciousness. Rev Boston wrote many a sermon from the W&U, while Rev Awdry immortalised the skirted steam trams and Class 04s as Toby and Mavis, respectively, in his Railway Series of books.

The tramway opened in 1883 to transport agricultural produce in the Wisbech area of East Anglia. Initially, it carried both passenger and freight traffic, importing coal and exporting flowers, fruit and vegetables.

Wisbech was a port until the 13th century when the estuary silted up. From the 1600s onwards, the excavation of canals and drainage channels gradually reclaimed the Fens for agricultural use, providing prosperity in the 19th and 20th centuries that attracted the railways to move produce to Midlands and London markets.

A branch line was proposed between Wisbech and Upwell, and built as a tramway to reduce costs. Its success hastened the demise of the canal that ran by it, and not all locals welcomed the railway's arrival. Noisy and dangerous shunting took place in residential areas, while railway wagons being loaded and unloaded adjacent to

passing road traffic was not unusual.

The tramway became part of the LNER in 1923, but competition from buses forced the withdrawal of passenger services in 1927. Freight traffic, however, stayed busy. In 1952, two Class 04 Drewry shunters replaced the steam trams but, by 1960, there was just one freight service each way per day. Economy measures followed, including the

closure of Boyce's Bridge and Outwell Village depots. The official closure took effect on May 23 1966 and the last train to leave Upwell was hauled by Drewry 0-6-0DM D2201 with a load of three open wagons and a brakevan.



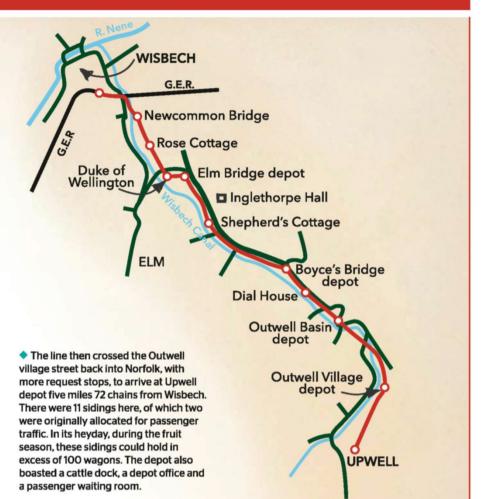

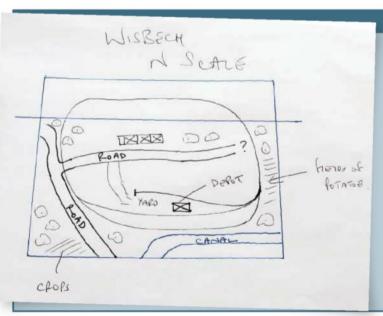

Route of the tramway

- The line began at Wisbech East station, with its small brick train shed built to house six tram locomotives.
- ◆ Elm Road Level Crossing was the first request stop on the line as it went from Cambridgeshire into Norfolk, running alongside Elm High Road. There were three request stops on this stretch.
- ◆ Elm Bridge depot featured a loop, siding and a goods office-cum-waiting shelter, courtesy of its timber extension. The line passed various request stops and ran near to the Wisbech canal and the road.
- ♠ Roughly halfway along the line, Boyce's Bridge depot featured a gated siding and a loop being used as a passing point for the passenger trams. There were more request stops until Outwell Basin depot where the canal was wider, providing mooring and room for barges to turn. The depot included a loop, a long siding, a booking office and a waiting room.
- ◆ The line then ascended a short 1-in-30 length of track back into Cambridgeshire, with the tram following the road and crossing the canal to enter Outwell Village depot. Here, coal was transferred via chutes to barges for distribution through the Fens. The depot office still stands, but most of the depot site is now covered by modern housing, complete with a cul-de-sac called The Tramway.





'N' gauge layout: Seven objectives

- To build a portable 'N' gauge layout that could be carried and erected by one person and allow trains to be running within ten minutes.
- To show the advantages of 'N' gauge by modelling 'trains in the landscape'.
- To make proprietary 'N' gauge track look as good as it possibly can be.

THE BASEBOARD

I wanted to build a baseboard light enough to be carried by one person, that I could rest on the kitchen table as I worked on it, and yet strong enough that it doesn't flex and damage track and scenery. It took me about an hour to build the 120cm by 82cm baseboard, using 5.5mm plywood for the surface and 18mm by 28mm softwood for the outer edge frame and two cross-members

The frame was both glued and nailed to the underside of the ply. I didn't use screws, which would have made the baseboard stronger, because I wanted to see if using the most basic construction techniques would be adequate for a small 'N' gauge layout. They were - and I'm really pleased with its lightweight nature.

The depot goods office

Only one of the W&U's standard goods offices survives, tucked away down one of Outwell's streets and surrounded by houses. The single-storey structure is built of red brick in Flemish bond with a slate hipped roof featuring deep eaves. There is a central doorway with a segmental arch and a four-panel door on the other end. There are two segmental arch window openings on one longer side, with 16-pane metal frame windows and stone windowsills. The other two sides are plain brick.

Arch Laser Co. has a growing range of 'OO' and 'N' gauge laser-cut buildings and accessories (retailed by Osborn's Models). Coincidentally, the company has just unveiled a new kit for this year, entitled GE Station Store, and this will become the layout's centrepiece. It's largely made from micro plywood with easy-to-follow pictorial instructions, and I recommend using fast-setting glue during assembly.



THE KIT'S CONTENTS

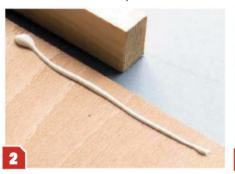

The sheet of 5.5mm plywood, planed timber lengths, PVA glue and round wire nails - I'm ready to make the baseboard.



Because I'd had the planed timber cut to size, I ran a bead of PVA glue along the underside of the ply where the frame would go. There were four side pieces and a single cross-member.

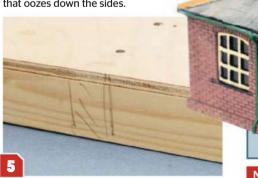


I secured the frame to plywood with G-cramps while the glue dried overnight. Then I hammered in the 25mm nails - one every 12-15cm around the frame for further solidity.

Use a wide paintbrush to spread the adhesive before placing the frame along the edges. Use a damp cloth to wipe away any glue that oozes down the sides.



Using a sharp pencil, I marked the position of the underside cross-members on the side pieces so that I would know where to position the nails.

HOW TO

BUILD A TREE FROM SCRATCH

Mike Harris turns over a new leaf and tries his hand at scratchbuilding a tree for the first time - using a rather unusual technique.

et these words be immortalised within the hallowed pages of *Model Rail*: this has to be the most tedious modelling project I've ever embarked on. But you know what? It might also be the most successful.

As far as I'm aware the method I've used to create the bark hasn't been published in the model railway press before, so it was something of a trip into the unknown. And at one point (at several points, actually) I considered scrapping the entire project altogether. But, following a pep talk from Chris Leigh, I decided to soldier on.

I'm glad I did, because I'm both pleased and pleasantly surprised at the finished result. And although the method might be laborious, it's not particularly difficult - not that I'd admit that to the rest of the *Model* Rail team...

The tree armature itself is made from florist's wire, which is a tried and tested method used by almost all of the great tree-builders over the years. However, what makes my method slightly different is the way I've created the bark.

I've used two-part epoxy putty. This thick, Blu Tack-consistency putty is popular

among wargamers and is often referred to as 'green stuff'. In expert hands, this form of putty can be used to sculpt some remarkably detailed miniatures.

But I wondered if it could be used to model tree bark. Sure enough, it could. I simply pressed the pliable putty with the point of a metal scribing instrument to form almost microscopic dots, then joined these to form various swirling patterns akin to those you'd find on the bark of a typical deciduous tree.

I say 'typical', because I wasn't intent on recreating any particular species of tree - if any *Model Rail* readers happen to be arborists, perhaps you'd like to e-mail me to let me know what my creation resembles most, I'd love to find out!

My only real reservation about using this method is how time-consuming it is. And that's because I found myself working on areas of putty around one square inch at a time. This was because it cures quickly and becomes too hard to scribe, yet it's still soft enough to ruin, should a stray finger rest upon it while working on another area of the tree.

However, if the time factor hasn't put you off, and the above image of my finished masterpiece has whetted your coniferscribing appetite (wrong tree, I know...) then grab a carving implement and 'leaf' the method to me: Here's how I did it...



Bunch florist wire into an even bundle (I used just over 30 60cm lengths to make my 15cm tall tree). Tightly wrap the centre of the bundle around your left index and middle finger - use your right hand if you're left-handed.



Still firmly holding the wire, tightly wrap the right end of the bundle around the other, as shown. You'll need to continue wrapping for another one or two rotations to create two 'branches' of wires.



Split each of the two 'branches' evenly in half to make four. Now twist each pair of stacks together, to form two secondary branches. You should now be left with four equal branches.



Keep splitting each wire stack into two and then twisting each arm of the pair together to create further branches until you run out of wire to separate and twist.



You should be left with short, single pieces of florist wire at the top of the armature. If any of these are a little too long, simply cut them down to size using a pair of wire cutters.



The same single top pieces of wire will likely be dead straight. I like to give them a little shape by bending them slightly - this can be achieved with a pair of needlenose pliers.



The base of the armature should resemble a single loop. Prise apart three or four adjacent pieces of wire and twist them to form smaller loops - these make for a sturdy base during construction and can be removed later.



Spend some time manipulating the branches of your armature. Refer to reference imagery of bare trees - in magazines, books or online - for inspiration if necessary, and try to aim for the most natural-looking frame possible.

Scatter brain

I really enjoyed using scatter from Green Scene, but as for the exact colours, you'll want to make that choice yourself. I wanted my tree to have a distressed, autumnal feel to fit alongside my wartime project layout 'Ardennes' so I chose my scatter accordingly.

That said, there's no reason why you couldn't use this same method to produce trees all year round. In fact, the carved bark works so well, it's almost a shame to cover it with leaves - so if you've a winter-themed layout, this might be the method for you, too.

Also make sure you pay attention to relevant source imagery, so be sure to take a stroll outside to view arboreal examples first-hand.



This method is intended for a foreground tree, so it can stand up to close scrutiny. If you'd like to find out how to build a background tree in record time, re-visit MR233, where I learn from tree-modelling master Paul Marshall-Potter.



Between your fingers, knead the yellow and blue strips of two-part putty together until the material appears as an even shade of green, with the pliable and workable consistency of Blu Tack.



Flatten the putty to roughly 1mm thick and submerge it in a cup of water (to make it easier to scribe). Starting at the base of the trunk, wrap the putty around the armature and smooth it out as you go along to hide any joins.



Immediately begin to scribe the pliable putty. I find that dabbing holes into the material to form bark lines of all lengths and directions works well. You can also fashion small knots for extra realism.



Now take a thin piece of card (a railway ticket is perfect!) and press the sides into the putty at random for further texture. Once you've finished with an area of putty, leave it to dry for 24 hours before moving onto the next section.



When the tree is covered in textured, hardened putty, place offcuts of sea moss (use tweezers and superglue) on the top branches. Deluxe Materials Roket Odourless cyano glue and Roket Cyano Glue Gel both work well.



Spray the tree with Halfords Primer Grey - covering all the putty. Once dry, spray on a light misting of Matt Black (concentrate the colour more at the base). Finally, mist on a generous coating of Rover Russet Brown.



Mix a brown paint colour that's slightly lighter than the base coat (I used Revell Leather Brown 84 and Wood Brown 382) and dry-brush it (see p76) on the bark. Keep lightening the mix and apply increasingly thin layers of paint.



Mist the top branches with firm-hold hairspray, avoiding the trunk, and sprinkle on some scatter, before misting on more hairspray. Repeat until you're satisfied with the result, and flick away scatter that's settled on the trunk.



Tease out the postiche until you're left with a thin veil of hair. Place this over the top branches in small areas. This helps to produce the uneven clumpy texture of leaves that appear on real trees.



sprinkle scatter on it. Try for an even spread of scatter to prevent it clumping together. If this does happen, gently flick or brush the area with your finger to unsettle the scatter.



The scatter was too brightly coloured for my eye, so I followed Paul Marshall-Potter's advice and misted earthy colours over it to tone it down. I used Rover Russet Brown, Ford Tuscan Beige, and Vauxhall Leaf Green from Halfords.



The paint spray from step 19 tarnished the bark, but that was nothing a few more layers of dry-brushing couldn't remedy. I can also recommend a very light dry-brush of grey acrylic to finish it off beautifully!

HOW TO

FINISH A LAYOUT

Chris Leigh concludes his Cornish harbour layout project - and tackles that final tricky detail - the backscene.



o, after a little under two years, we come to the end of my Cornish harbour layout project, otherwise known as 'Polwyddelan'. The choice of name was not ideal as no one else in the office seems able to pronounce it, let along spell it. On reflection, that may just add to the 'Cornishness' of it because there are a few Cornish names that are tongue-twisters. Try

Fowey, Mousehole and Launceston on a few of your friends if you doubt me.

This is a 'wrapping up' feature, with several small jobs and loose ends to be completed. I'll look, briefly, at the DCC installation and the fitting of decoders to a couple of the locomotives and units, and I'll highlight some of the details and assemble and fit the backscene

THE LITTLE DETAILS

FLAGS Britain seems to have become flag-obsessed in recent years and where once the Union Flag was flown on a few special occasions, we now seem to fly all manner of flags at the slightest excuse! The Cornish are fiercely proud of their black and white flag, and I printed this example off the Internet. I made it by reducing it to appropriate size on the computer,

printing two copies and mounting them back-to-back. I wrapped one end around a fine thread to represent rope.

The same method was used to produce the flags on the Blue Peter Inn, though I chose different flags from those on the real Polperro pub. However, I did receive an adverse comment from a Cornish colleague about the use of "that English flag"!

> ICE CREAM I have two Oxford ice cream vans, but I settled on the Wall's Bedford for use on the layout. I selected appropriate figures for the queue, while the little girl's ice cream is about to be stolen by a Langley seagull mounted on a strip of

clear Perspex.

BEACH HUTS The four colourful beach huts are kit KX014 from Model Railway Scenery (http://goo.gl/PGbwm9). This is a £1.99 printed card kit. I varied the green hut by cutting the walls back to leave a roof overhang and fitted the door open with a figure about to emerge.

SIGNS I used a lot of photographs of signs and shop fronts, reduced to scale size on computer and printed out. These not only save a lot of time - they provide a level of authenticity which is difficult to achieve by any other means. Though the shop itself is based on one in St Ives, the window displays are

from Diagon Alley at the Warner Bros Harry Potter studio tour.

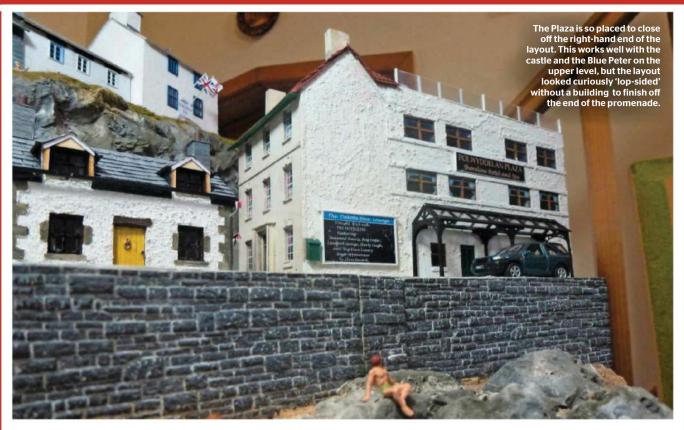
> I also wanted to include Model Rail staff names, so the rock band playing at the Plaza includes members of the editorial team, some of whom are actually musical (only Leigh and Lowery aren't). Various signs and notices were made on my computer to suit specific locations.

TEDDY It is important to place figures in logical groups, each with its own 'story'. Walking figures are much less common than standing figures, but this Preiser family is hurrying back down to the beach because the younger child has lost her teddy bear.

The Plaza



I needed just one fairly substantial building to act as a 'bookend' at the right-hand end of the seafront. I had bought Petite Properties' low-relief three-storey Victorian house just because I liked the look of it, but I could not contrive a use for it on the layout. I decided to modify it and turn it into a full-depth structure. I then added a not-so-pretty extension to turn it into a hotel.

It seems that many West Country resorts have, in the past, allowed developments which are not aesthetically appropriate, and that's what I've tried to replicate. The Polwyddelan Plaza is such a development. It isn't very beautiful but it is the primary commercial development in the village, being a three-storey, beach-front hotel with a sun deck.



Above: I had originally intended that the hotel would have lots of balconies on the seaward side, but eventually I went for the roof-top sun deck instead. Noch and Preiser produce a number of packs of figures with accessories such as sunbeds and patio furniture.

Right: The gable end provides access from the hotel and there are Perspex screens all round as a health and safety measure. Glazing sheet and styrene strip was mounted on top of the parapet wall.

Below: I wanted to preserve the attractive frontage of the Petite Properties villa, but it faces discreetly away from the shore, providing a staff entrance to the hotel. Another item which I wanted to use was a Metcalfe Models PO572 Arcade shop front, and this provides a glazed, covered entrance for hotel quests.





DCC UPGRADES

I have several favourite models from my 'Blackdog Halt' layout which I want to use on 'Polwyddelan'. These are DMUs, mostly based on the Lima models. These had the chassis with the 'pancake' motor and traction tyres on two wheels. I did not wish to spend time converting these old mechanisms to DCC but, fortunately, there is an easier route to the same end.

Hornby took over the Lima tooling and re-tooled the chassis with a conventional mechanism and - more significantly for my needs - an eight-pin DCC socket. So in order to run my DMUs on the new layout, I've been looking out for Hornby Class 121s at cheap prices from which I can rob their chassis. Unfortunately, the Hornby model still commands quite high prices. I can, however, refit the Hornby body to my old Lima chassis and then look to sell it to recoup some of my expenditure.

The units to be 'digitised' are a couple of single railcars, a Class 121 and a Class 122, and a three-car Swindon Class 120, which is a Craftsman kit of etched overlays on a Lima unit.

I used a Hatton's eight-pin decoder and fixed it in place with some masking tape. The Hornby mechanism leaves plenty of space within the quard's compartment.

The method of attaching the body is the same on both Lima and Hornby units, a pair of substantial self-tapping screws in the underside, and clips at both ends.

My Lima chassis had been fitted with hoses and MU cables of my own manufacture, and I managed to find enough leftovers to detail the bufferbeam of the new chassis.



I transferred the interior, seats and partitions from the old chassis to the new one, and also removed the surplus solebar steps, moving others to align with the doors where necessary.



The Class 120 is a personal favourite and I'm pleased to have it fit for use on the new layout. I fitted all the trailer coaches with Bachmann coach wheels, as their profile is finer than the old I ima ones.



The DCC programming track is just a short length of track connected to the programming outputs of the controller. Setting up the new address is a two-minute job.



Once I've set up the new address I like to give models a good test run. Since the only continuous DCC circuit that I have is on my Canadian layout, the Swindon unit looks a little out of place, but it's definitely moving!



Once you have several DCC-fitted models, it is easy to forget their addresses, so I record them in this register. I had trouble re-addressing the two sound-equipped Bachmann models, so my local shop, Trains4U, did it for me.

MAKE A BACKSCENE

A backscene is essential to most model railways. It contains the viewer's attention within the layout boundaries and prevents the full-size background from being a distraction. The correct backscene also helps to identify the setting of the railway. That was where I ran into problems. North Cornwall's scenery is distinctive. Near to the coast, the landscape is open moorland. Any trees are quite small, and there are rocky outcrops and the remnants of mining activity.

I searched for a suitable printed backscene but found none. Eventually,

I settled on a highly inappropriate scene with lots of trees. All this detail was, however, in the foreground, and above it there was a good blue summer sky which was certainly right for Cornwall. I decided that, with a bit of careful planning, I could cover the foreground trees and buildings with more appropriate structures. Actually finding suitable pictures proved quite difficult, until I browsed a file of photographs that I took in 2009. First, however, I scoured the Internet. I found images that might have been usable, but they were such low resolution that they printed really badly.

This is the backscene that I bought. ID Backscenes produces photographic scenes to suit various scales, as do several other manufacturers, including Peco. Plain sky papers are also available, as are self-adhesive 'scenes.



I wanted a row of buildings to provide an artificial horizon when seen from normal viewing angles. I printed out examples from my own photographs to see if I could combine them to get the effect I wanted.



Here's a first attempt, with photographs cut out and positioned with a stone wall in front. I attempted to size the photographs so that the buildings were much smaller than scale in order to give a sense of perspective.



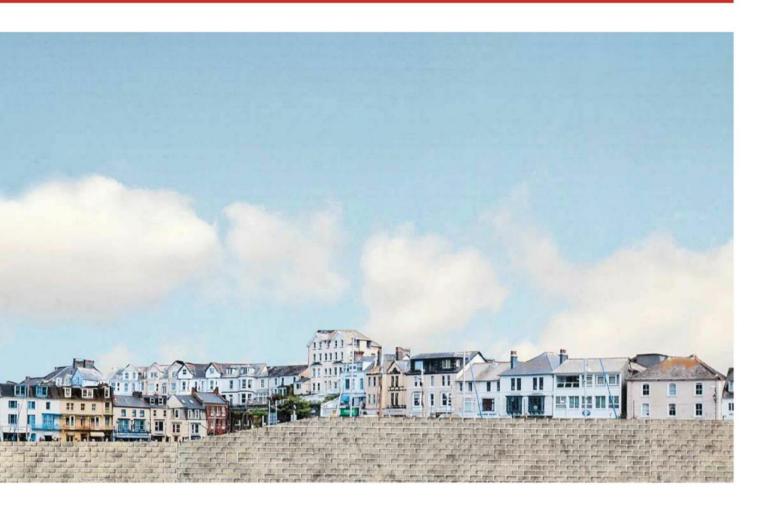
I planned to mount the backscene on 5mm thick foamboard and to make it removable. The first job was to trim the white borders off the printed backscene. I found it easiest to do this with a cutting mat on the floor.



My backscene was not self-adhesive, so I used 3M Spray Mount. I sprayed it onto the foamboard, working outdoors. My backscene will have joins due to the size of the foamboard, but the printed backscenes are about 5ft long.



I wrapped the top edge of the backscene over the edge of the foamboard in order to reduce the risk of frayed edges. I wanted the backscene to hide extraneous background, but not to dominate the layout.





I now needed to conceal those trees with appropriate buildings. I used pictures from Ilfracombe and Looe, but in due course I may replace them with pictures taken specifically for the purpose in North Cornwall.



Here's the finished arrangement, glued in place with Spray Mount. In order to obtain sufficient length, I've used one photograph twice, but flipped it horizontally so that the repetition is less obvious.



I did a 'dry run' to arrange the pictures in a way that worked, laying one strip of buildings behind another to give a degree of perspective. The harbour in the foreground will be completely hidden.



The backscene temporarily fitted behind a wall of Metcalfe stonework. This will be replaced with Wills stone to match the rest of the layout when the precise position of the backscene is fixed.

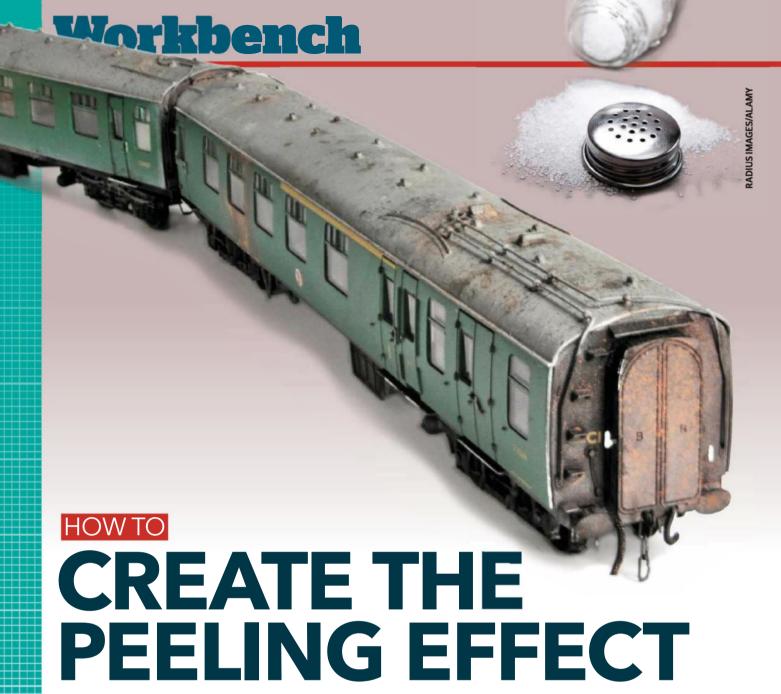

* It just seems like forever. I ran out of steam on this project as it drew to a close and these final tidying-up jobs took me far longer than they ought to have done. Only the sight of Mike's excellent photographs of the beach scene finally reignited my enthusiasm to finish the job.

I guess modelling to a deadline dampens my enthusiasm a little. It shouldn't be a problem for readers, however.



Salty water is well-known to have a destructive corrosive effect on some metals, but did you know you can also use it to make brilliant weathering stencils? **Steve Nall** takes you through the process, step by step.

othing corrodes metal like salt. Witness the way salty sea air turned painted locomotives into piles of rust in Woodham's Barry scrapyard, or how road grit eats away at the wheel arches of your car.

Visit most preserved railways and you'll probably see at least one Mk 1 coach with its roof peeling. It's a sight so commonly linked to Mk 1s that I really wanted to recreate it on my models.

You can use the salt granules that would normally be sprinkled on your chips to mimic the way this mineral, when wet, eats into metal. Of course, salt doesn't have a corrosive effect on plastic - so what I'm doing is using the salt crystals to make a stencil.

This salt-rusting technique is something that military modellers have used for a long time, as it's particularly effective at recreating a 'randomised' peeling look - where the roof covering has come away to reveal rusty metal underneath. It's perfect for when you want to show chipped metal surfaces, where the lower level of paint would be either metallic or a primer, and the top layer would be the colour.

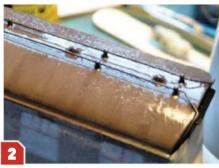
Having gone through my Bachmann Mk 1 fleet, adding Masokits' detailing parts and suchlike, I thought I'd use the salt technique to treat their roofs. Here's how I did it...

A typical, unloved Mk1 coach roof - old, distressed, pale and corroded and in need of restoration. Pay attention to welded seam lines - emphasise a few but don't make them too obvious. KEVERS/ALAMY





Mask the coach body, leaving the roof exposed. Apply a coat of Phoenix's Brake Dust enamel paint to represent rust. Apply weathering powders or chalks for colour and texture variety. A hairdryer speeds drying if required.



Use a trigger sprayer bottle (under £1.00 from hardware stores or garden centres) to mist water over the entire roof. Add a small drop of washing-up liquid to help break down the surface tension of the water.



powders of your choice over some areas. Use the hairdryer to prevent the salt dissolving. Be gentle - if the spray (either from airbrush or aerosol) is too heavy, the granules stick.



Mist on grey paint and sprinkle weathering



Sprinkle coarse salt granules over the wet area.

Use a hairdryer on gentle setting to remove the

water. This helps to preserve sharp lines around

the salt. If you want a more mottled, softer

effect, leave the salt to dissolve for a while.

Once the surfaces are completely dry, brush off the salt crystals. Start by using your fingers, use a brush for any remaining ones and then use a scalpel or wooden toothpick for really stubborn granules.



Don't remove all the salt. You can leave a few of the finer crystals in place - these give the impression of corrosion, where the rust is bubbling underneath the painted surface, as seen on many preserved machines.



The Mk 1 roof ribs (which I had cut away) did not need emphasising - you can tell they're seam marks - but overall the roof is smooth like the prototype. With a small brush, I painted a thin, dirty wash on each ventilator to highlight them.

Mind the gap

One little job that will bring life to any coach is to highlight the gap between the door and the body. In the past, I've flooded the door gap with thinned black paint and applied thinners to remove the brush marks. All this does is reduce the lustre of the original paint. This time, having applied a thinned black to the door gap, I used a dry wooden cocktail stick to scrape away the brush marks. The result emphasises the door gap but the original deep colour is retained.





The last job is to fix the weathering in place. For this finishing touch, mist on a matt varnish, such as Phoenix's Matt Varnish, and sprinkle a final few 'clouds' of weathering powders over a couple of areas as required.



Take a step back and review the overall effect. If you wish to, apply thin washes to represent rusting streaks, but don't go overboard! The pipes on top of the roof did not need highlighting, so I left them.

Workbench



aser-cutting is having an increasing impact on the hobby as a means of preparing a multitude of materials accurately cut and sized ready for the keen hobbyist. My 'Fountain Colliery' layout (MR237) uses a laser-cut baseboard from the excellent Tim Horn range (www.timhorn.co.uk).

Laser-cutting can be used for many things and not just baseboards. Petite Properties, an established doll's house kit producer, recently entered the model railway market with a range of kit buildings in 'N', 'OO' and 'O'. They're laser-cut from thin, high-quality MDF.

I use the term 'kit' loosely, because they are more scratchbuilders' aids. The 'kit' is

a basic structure; how it's finished is down to you. Those of you who've only ever built plastic kits might be disappointed in that you might expect only to have to assemble, glue and then paint the model to get the job done.

However, these kits are competitively priced, and most are a fraction of the price of a similar, traditional plastic kit. They also suit the modeller who wishes to create something a little more bespoke, as well as learn some new skills that could one day be applied to a full scratchbuilt structure.

For this project, I chose Petite Properties' 'Blackberry Farm' kit, a fairly generic semi-rural structure which could suit many a layout. The beauty of the range is that this farmhouse doesn't have to be finished as a farmhouse. It could be converted quite easily into a private dwelling or, in this case, a pub. A building like this lends itself to many kinds of finish: it could work as brick, plaster rendered stucco or, as in this instance, stone.

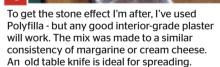
Petite Properties has filled a void in the market with these inexpensive and basic





What you

Craft knife and fresh blades Steel ruler PVA woodworking glue **P**olyfilla (or similar) Scrap paper







Layer a thin screed of plaster over the whole surface. Around 1mm-2mm thick is ideal. Spread the plastering over a couple of sessions if you don't feel confident handling a building covered on all sides with sticky plaster.



As the plaster started to set, I found that stippling it with a 1in decorator's brush helped to achieve a slightly more even surface. It also adds a little texture. Practice makes perfect.



kits, providing the keen modelling hobbyist with the chance to learn a few new skills in the process, while not having to get too bogged down designing a feasible building from scratch.

Over the years, I've constructed many buildings, but this pub has been one of the most fun to do. Keep an eye out for Petite Properties at some of the bigger model railway exhibitions, as the company continues to expand its range with new and interesting buildings.

The completed building, ready for scribing. Leave it overnight to dry before going to the next step. I prefer to mist a little Halfords matt black over the plaster before scribing the stonework - it helps me to see what I'm doing!



I wanted a slightly honey-coloured, aged look for my stonework. Using matt enamels (acrylic or even matt emulsion will work too), I drybrushed on a mid-grey. Try to avoid making the coverage too even, so it looks more natural.



Time for a little more grey! If you're new to this, seek out light and dark grey, beige, cream and honey shades. If in doubt, choose lighter and less saturated colours than you think you'll need. Subtlety is key.

Dry-brushing

Dry-brushing is an extremely useful technique to master. Basically, it's a paintbrush holding a mere suggestion of your chosen paint. When you apply the brush it leaves behind a hint of the paint on raised details alone.

An easy way to prepare your brush is to dip it in the paint, then wipe it on a bit of rag or paper towel to remove most of the paint - you are now ready to go. This method can be used for all sorts of weathering. You'll find the result most satisfying, and no doubt you'll want to use it in several areas of layout building.



A pointed instrument, such as a nail or pair of compasses, can be used to quickly scribe the stonework. Look at photographs of stone buildings for inspiration - search for 'stone buildings close up' in Google Images.



Stonework often has a variety of colours, from reds, greens, yellow and browns. I build up a few layers of random colours, taking care to allow previous colours to show through here and there. I used a little brick-red here...



Windows, doors and bargeboards are also supplied. Paint them before installation. I like to use dull colours as white-painted wood wasn't common in the 'old days'. Bear this in mind when portraying an historical scenario.



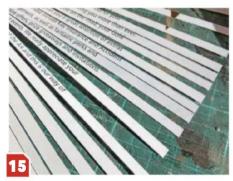
Junk mail and flyers are often printed on thin, smooth, slightly glossy paper, which is perfect for modelling - and making roof slates, as here. Use a straight edge and a fresh blade to cut it into strips, then squares, about 5mm by 5mm.



Once the stone effects have been added to the whole building, the next step is to colour it. First, spray the whole building with matt black paint. Work in a well-ventilated area, or outside on a still day, to minimise exposure to fumes.



...plus pale grey, honey and cream colours. Then add a little more grey. The trick is knowing when to stop, but it's not an exact science. Over my years of painting, I have perfected a multitude of colour finishes.



There are several ways to portray a slated roof, some use embossed plastic card, others use strips of thin card. I think the slow way is worth the effort, the result here taking no longer than a couple of hours for the whole building.



To help keep slates straight and level, I use a ruler and pencil to add a few guidelines on the roof of the building. As I'm a 'less-than-accurate' model maker, I use every trick in the book to prevent things going awry.



Work on one row of slates at a time, from the base upwards. Brush on a thin layer of PVA, pick up a slate with the tip of the scalpel and drop it into position. If it's not perfect, don't worry - because a little wonkiness adds to the charm.

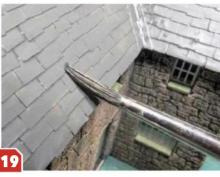
After gluing the capping in place, I used

brick-red paint to colour it when dry. I made

a simple mask from scrap paper to protect the

slates and stippled on the paint. In my opinion,

a slightly uneven effect looks the most realistic.



Now apply some mid-grey paint to your slates. I prefer matt enamel. Two thin coats are better than one thick one. Try not to clog up the joins with thick paint. Next, make ridge capping tiles from thicker card (a cereal packet is ideal).



Other colours can be added to suggest moss and bird droppings. Look at the real thing - colours vary a lot, so a roof is certainly not 'just grey'. Details like guttering and downpipes can be fashioned from plastic rod.

Making signs

From farmhouse to pub: the 'Miners Arms' public house sign was created in a photograph-editing package. Of course, you could take a photo of your chosen name on a real building and print that out instead.

It can be tricky to work out what size you'll need. I tend to place the images into a Microsoft Word document several times at different sizes, then print it and cut a few out to see which one works the best.

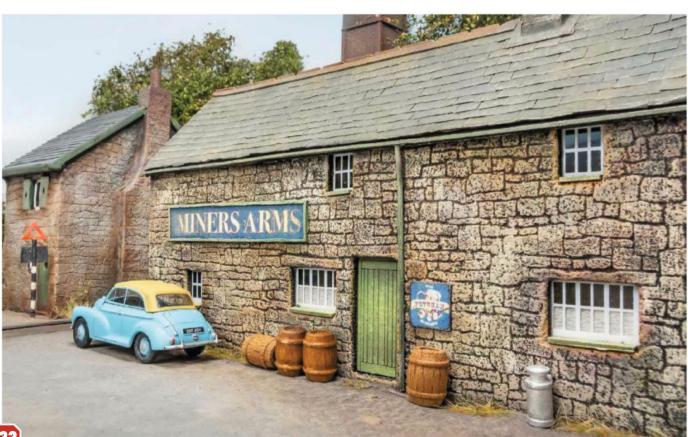






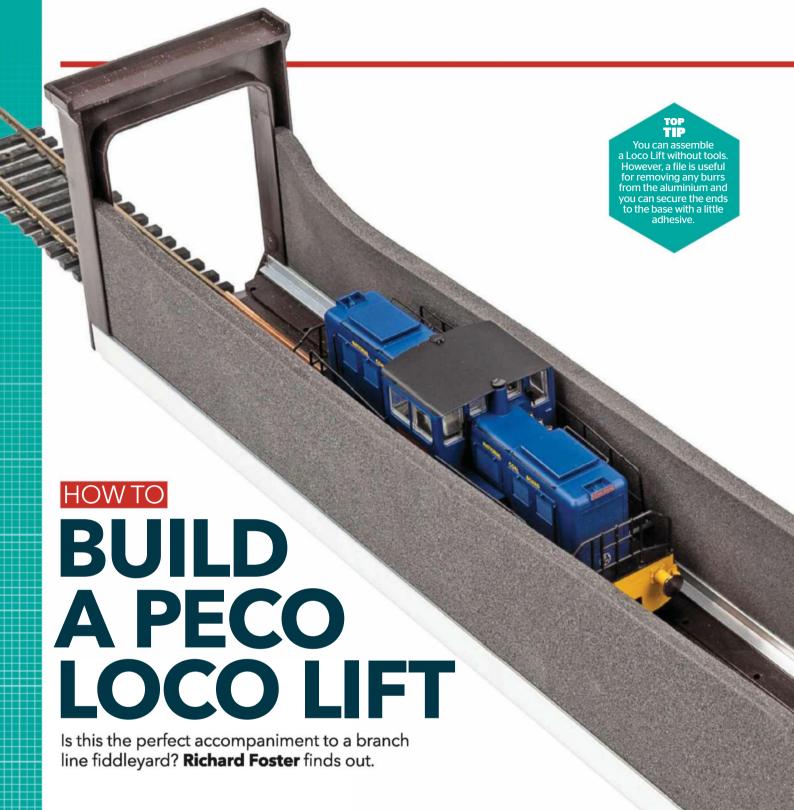






Finally, all you need are a few casks and a few ale-swilling punters to add a little life. I haven't got around to adding any figures yet, so my excuse is that it's outside pub opening hours - or maybe there's a cheeky 'lock-in' going on!

nyone who has handled a modern ready-to-run locomotive will know just how fragile they seem to be. There's nothing inherently filmsy about the way that they're made, it's just that there are so many fine parts attached that you don't know how to handle them. Even if you have the nimblest fingers, it's so very easy to knock bits off.

Space is also an issue for modellers. You never really have enough of it, whether that's trying to get in that extra siding in your goods yard or working out the most effective way to store all your trains in the fiddleyard. Models are just so good nowadays that few can resist their charms; consequently, most of us have rather extensive collections of increasingly fragile models to store.

Peco's Loco Lift is arguably the product that combats both issues. It's been around for decades and dates from a time when model locomotives didn't have all those lovely but oh-so-fragile parts. But that doesn't mean that it's obsolete. In fact, it's arguably more relevant for today's modellers.

The Loco Lift allows you to move models around without touching them. It sits on the track, collecting power from the running rails. You drive the locomotive straight on to it and then you can lift the locomotive clear without touching it.

Not only does this eliminate the risk of breakage - it also helps to save space in the fiddleyard. You no longer need points and loops for a locomotive to run round its train; drive on to the Loco Lift, lift clear and place it on the other end of the train.

each other. Sounds perfect, doesn't it?

Loco Lift sounded ideal for my 'Gedney' layout. It would enable locomotives to be stored off the layout, as well as providing 'hands free' shunting. However, even though the Loco Lift has been around for so long, I've never actually seen a single example, let alone assembled one.

Now was the time to find out...

The Loco Lift comes in 'flat packed' form: the plastic/aluminium base is ready-assembled, but you need to put the foam sides in place and add the ends.



Place the foam into the channel and slide it along. You will need to pull from one end and use your other hand to push it along. It's a tight fit and the foam is quite stretchy.



Once you've got one foam side in position, do the other. You won't be able to keep the foam taut. Use two hands - if you only use one, you'll pull the foam out of its channel.



The end pieces should align with the aluminium. However, the fit is very tight and it requires a good bit of jiggling to get everything aligned. The foam squeezes into slots on the ends.



Fit the other end piece. This will also take a little while to slot home correctly. Place one end on a hard surface and press down firmly on the other to securely fix both ends.





Place the Loco Lift onto the track, ensuring that it sits firmly on the running rails. Now drive a locomotive onto it. It works perfectly under both analogue and digital control.

Conclusions

I'd always assumed that the Loco Lift was essentially a plastic box, so it was a little surprising to find that only the base and ends are plastic (with copper rails). The sides are actually foam and these, along with the base and ends, are held together with aluminium angle.

Construction is straightforward but not always easy. The foam doesn't slide into its slot particularly easily, and the ends are a bit of a pain to fit.

That said, it works as it should, although the foam sides mean that it isn't the easiest thing to lift. The stacking feature works well, but one word of warning - hold the Loco Lift off-balance, and your locomotive will slide out.

Loco Lift is a valuable tool to have, but its crude construction and flimsy feel do leave a bit to be desired. It does the job, but I can't but feel that the door is open for another manufacturer to develop something a little better.

firmly believe that the railway should celebrate its past and maintain traditions and old ways. GBRf's decision to paint the last Class 66, 66779, in BR green as an homage to '9F' No. 92220, was, to me, a great one. Now the company has turned to that long-standing tradition, set by the 'Warships' and the Class 50s, of naming locomotives after warships.

66775, one of the last batch of '66s' delivered in March 2016, emerged from Arlington Fleet Services' Eastleigh workshops this summer and was named at a ceremony at HM Naval Base Devonport on July 12.

It may look as though it carries standard GBRf livery, but Bob Tiller, Engineering Director for GB Railfreight Ltd, has done a good job of creating a livery with some lovely, subtle touches. There's the real HMS *Argyll*'s pennant number on the bodyside, ship's badge and billowing Royal Navy White Ensign under the cab windows.

To undertake this conversion, you'll need a Tier 2 Class 66, such as Bachmann's 32-982, as well as Precision Labels' decal set (available in both 'N' and 'OO').

Factfile: HMS Argyll

HMS *Argyll* is the oldest of the 13 Type 23 frigates built for the Royal Navy. It was laid down in 1987 at Yarrow Shipbuilders, Glasgow, and was launched in 1989. The ship has led an interesting career and has undertaken a range of duties, from playing a part in Britain's military intervention in Sierra Leone's civil war to escorting the Queen during her stay aboard *Hebridean Princess* in 2006. It is currently being used for Sea Ceptor missile trials.

Since its purchase by EQT Partners, 66775 is the first locomotive to carry the revised GBRf livery without the Europorte blue and red emi-circles and Europorte logos

Remove the four screws that secure the chassis to the body. Ease a thin, flat screwdriver between the body and the chassis and open up a gap enough to slide a piece of card in between the two.



Do the same to the other side, then pull the body away from the chassis. Don't pull the two halves apart just yet! Remove the two screws from each of the the cab light units. Now the body can be removed. Keep the screws somewhere safe.



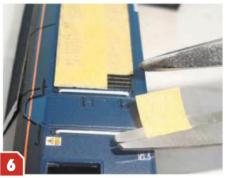
The next stage is to remove the exhaust silencer assembly by easing a craft knife under the lower edge of the silencer and levering it away. If you're using a sharp blade to do this, be very careful!



Next, remove the windows; they will need a good push: two side ones first, then the front one. Again, put them somewhere safe, along with the window wipers. Note: if you can't push them out, you'll need to mask them off.



Remove the nose numbers. You can use T-Cut car polish and cotton buds, but I scrape them with a small, homemade chisel. Mask the yellow warning panels with Tamiya tape, using photographs as references.



You'll need to preserve the black side grilles. Use small squares of Tamiya masking tape, making sure that they touch the edges. Firmly press the tape down onto the bodyside. Seal



any gaps with Humbrol Maskol.



When you're happy with the coverage of the tape, seal all the joints with Humbrol Maskol. Be thorough - you'll be surprised just where sprayed paint can get into.

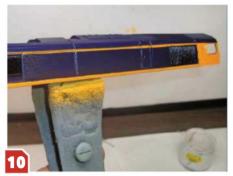


After removing the DRS logos with T-Cut, prime the body with Halfords grey aerosol spray, allow to dry, then spray with RailMatch GBRf gold.

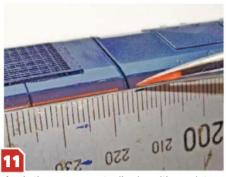


I used GBRf-supplied artwork to mask the gold areas, but prototype photographs will do just as well. Mask the gold areas with Tamiya tape and use Humbrol Maskol to seal the joints.

Workbench



Apply GBRf blue (RailMatch 269) and allow to dry. Remove the masking tape and then give it a good coat of gloss varnish. Leave overnight to dry.



Apply the orange cant rail using either paint and a bow pen with a steel rule, or apply Fox Transfers' orange cant rail transfer.



When the cant rail is secure or dry, use the bow pen or a fine paintbrush to paint the handrails on the body side and cab ends white.



This is Precision Labels' pack D75-0 4mm '00' gauge transfer for 66775 *HMS Argyll*, priced £14.99 (order from *www.precisionlabels.com*).



Carefully cut out all the transfers for one side. Minimise the size of the carrier film around the transfer, but don't handle them too much.



Measure the centre of the transfer and, when flooded with water, slide it into position central to the middle of the section.



Start in the centre and carefully remove the water from under the transfer. I use a cotton bud, keeping the outsides wet so they can be pushed into the body corrugations.



Finally, when thoroughly dry, give them a coat of water-based varnish, allow to dry then spray with standard RailMatch satin varnish.



To complete, the chassis needs the yellow front area to be painted into GBRf gold and the bufferheads painted silver.

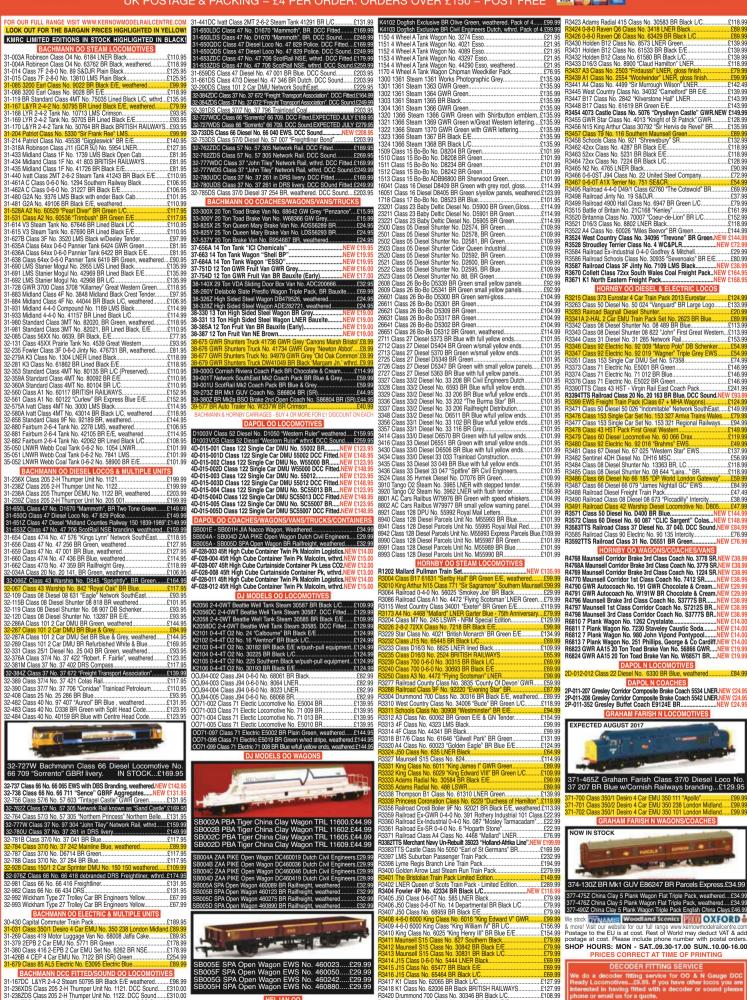

Here is a sneak preview of some of the layouts that will be there:

Bear Creek

Bear Creek is a fictitious slice of Western Canada with no special location. It has tried to capture the main elements of this area of Canada, namely the rugged mountain scenery and fir trees! Freight movement is the focus of train operations and a simple track plan allows for a variety of trains to be run.

Glenellen Castle

Glenellen Castle is a continuous run-round with a 10 road storage yard. It has a small halt with a timber siding next to a coastal Loch in a heathland setting and a viaduct crossing an 'Abhainn' (Scottish river, stream or estuary). The castle is scratch built, each stone individually scribed into DAS clay. Rolling stock is Dapol and Graham Farish with some NGS kits, (no distilleries, just lots of Sottish scenery).

Invercalley

The layout was inspired by an article in Ian Futer's book Scottish Layout projects. The track plan has been modified slightly and a small locomotive shed has been added. The stock is typical of that seen in the Highlands during the 1960's and the buildings are based on real examples in Inverary.

Kings Park

Kings Park is based on a location North-West of London on the West Coast Main Line (WCML). During the 1980's the area covered were the A/C main lines of British Rail and The Bakerloo Underground and Watford Overground of Queens Park Town Station and Willesden Depot.

Snow Valley

Snow Valley is made up of two sides. One side is a wintery scene and the other is a summery scene. It has two stations, shops and a pub, with working lights which give it a realistic look.

Somewhere at the South of Germany/Austria

Various layouts with scenes from the country, like gardens, bridges, stations etc. combined with a large fiddle yard. It is operated by a mixed crew from the owner clubs. The fascination of the layout is, that we are able to build it depending on the space given to us, even if there are things like support piles ore L-shaped rooms we will find a way to create the layout.

Tennis Court Sidings

This is a British N Gauge layout set in the present in the south west of England. It's a small preservation site seldom open to the public, but the local bus enthusiasts have totally renovated the old Western National garage and surrounding area. They are holding a bus rally and the railway is also open.

Bite-sized BRANCHIE

Tony Minchin moved from 'OO' to 'N' in a bid to conserve space. Thirty years and many layouts later and he's never looked back.



LAYOUT ASHBURTON

uring the reign of the GWR branch line layout, Ashburton was one of the most popular locations to model. But the increasingly varied selection of ready-to-run stock available now means that modellers are no longer bound by Western Region prototypes.

For some, however, the romantic notion of an Ashburton layout still burns brightly. And it's a good job too, because Tony Minchin's delightful 1:148 scale take on the Devonshire classic is too good to miss.

And if you attend this year's International N Gauge Show (p84), you won't miss it!

BOOKWORM

It was an impromptu purchase of *Great Western* Branch Line Termini (Vol 2) by Paul Karau that

inspired Tony to model Ashburton.

He recalls: "I've never visited Ashburton, but I have been on the South Devon Railway, and that's where I bought the book."

Tony describes himself as a serial layout builder. In fact, he reckons he can average two layouts per year.

"I'm retired so it gives me something to do," he explains. "Ashburton' took me around six months to complete, but I was able to work on it most days."

Like most modellers, Tony started building in 'OO' gauge. He moved into 'N' gauge around 30 years ago so he could better indulge his layout building habit.

"We live in a small house so I had to economise," he says. "Yes, 'OO' gauge is easier to see - my

eyesight isn't brilliant nowadays - but I've got five other layouts stacked in the garage. Building in 1:148 scale has allowed me the space to house them."

Tony is a club man too, having joined the West Midlands N Gauge Club ten years ago.

"It's a friendly little club," he says. "I was having trouble with pointwork, so I got in touch and they invited me to come along - I've been going ever since."

The thirst for layout building complements Tony's love of exhibiting. He explains: "I really like going to shows and exhibiting my layouts, but it can be tiring. Luckily my wife Jane, together with my friend Linn Dempster, help me to operate them."

WALL-TO-WALL

He might have a lot of time to build layouts, but Tony still works extremely fast. As such, he's developed a model making repertoire of super-slick constructional methods, chief of which is scratchbuilt buildings.

The materials used to build each building rarely differ - embossed plastic card and etched brass details. But it's how he defines the scale of each building that really impresses.

Tony explains: "I'll judge everything from an 'N' gauge figure." Using the figure as a scale indicator, Tony can calculate the dimensions of a typical door, which can then be used to define the scale or placement of everything else.

"I have come unstuck a couple of times," he admits. "But there's usually a workaround. If I've cut a door and it's slightly the wrong size, sometimes I'll pop a step underneath to balance it out.

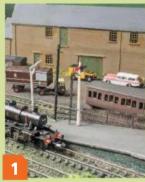
"I don't just use figures. Sometimes I'll place a locomotive beside a structure to help judge the scale. I do have a couple of scale rulers too, but I only use those if I'm *really* stuck."

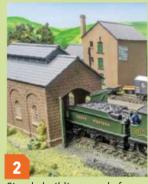




3 things we like

What makes this layout great?



'Ashburton' embodies the 'N' gauge ethos; 'OO' modeller's love for layout building outgrows the available space. So what does he do? He turns to 1:148 scale and suddenly doesn't have to compromise on anything. The proof is in the pudding, a quintessential British outline branch line layout within a 5ft by 2ft baseboard. Space restrictions sorted.

OLD RELIANT

The layout is set between 1950 and 1955. However, car enthusiasts may have spotted a Mini, which wasn't introduced until 1959. It's something that Tony only noticed after the photoshoot and, although it's a small error, it's disrupted Tony's quest for excellence.

"It's just behind the Reliant van, which I can just get away with," says Tony. "I like to keep things pretty accurate to the time period I'm attempting to portray." But he also sees the funny side.

"I always spot little mistakes like that on other layouts (not that I'd ever say anything), and now I've gone and done the same thing!" he laughs.

The two-dimensional, hand-painted houses on the backscene are painted onto cork sheet. Tony cut

around the buildings and stuck them onto the backscene. The thickness of the cork, together with fully 3D modelled gardens, is very effective at creating both relief and additional depth.

Tony used photography as a reference, which he sourced from old newspaper cuttings and his Paul Karau book. In addition, he searched the Internet and found more images using Google.

The backscene becomes shallower at the left-hand side in order to accommodate a hidden fiddleyard. The small size of the layout means it uses an end-to-end track plan, but Tony enjoys the hands-on approach that the setup demands at exhibitions: "You can't leave it. You really have to work at it all of the time while operating," he explains.

The water tower and coaling stage are both scratchbuilt from plastic card.

PUT TRACK TO BED

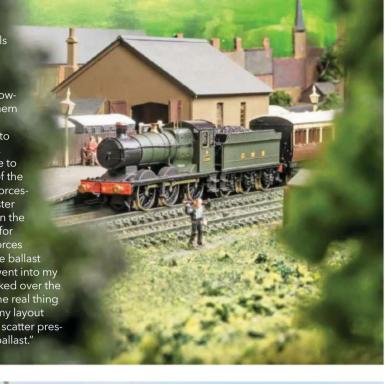
Polystyrene and papier-mâché is Tony's tried and tested method when it comes to hills and embankments. He uses wallpaper paste and newspaper to form the papier-mâché, which he then leaves for over a week to dry.

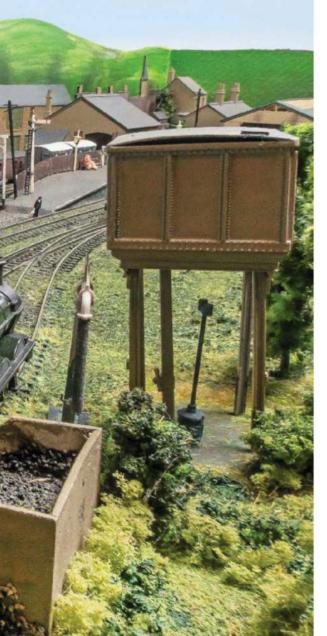
"I paint it with green emulsion which, without the layer of newspaper, would melt the polystyrene," he warns. "I tend to work in small sections at a time, applying a layer of scatter to finish."

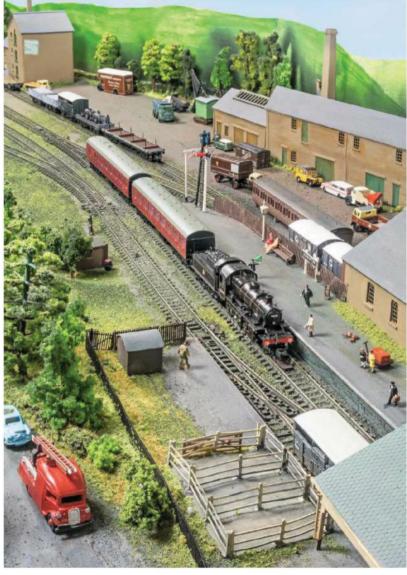
The track is weathered with a simple misting of black Halfords spray paint, followed by a touch of ballast. Tony explains: "I'm careful not to use too much ballast as it's very easy to block points when working in 'N' gauge.

Coloured pastels and charcoals are used for weathering. Tony crushes them into a fine powder and applies them using a dry brush, which also serves to blend the colours.

Tony is fortunate to live right in front of the Birmingham to Worcester via Kidderminster line. "I haven't seen the weed-killing train for years. The grass forces its way through the ballast and takes over. I went into my back garden, peeked over the fence, and used the real thing as inspiration for my layout - hence the green scatter present between the ballast."









TRY, TRY, TRY AGAIN... It's hardly surprising that what is perhaps the most interesting building on the layout was the hardest to scratchbuild, and that's the gasworks.

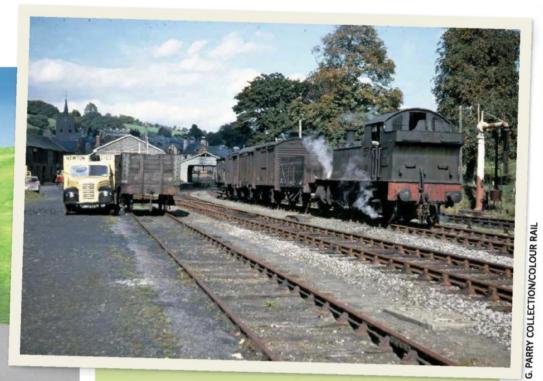
"It was built using cardboard and some leftover plastic bits I had lying around," says Tony.
"It took me two or three goes before I even got it close to resembling the prototype. One problem was that the card was too thin, so

I laminated it to slightly improve its durability.

"In fact, I actually thought it might defeat me at one stage, but you can't let a model beat you. Keep trying until you get it right!"

Such a statement really highlights Tony's resolve as a modeller. He's been model making since the early 1960s, and despite fighting space restrictions, all manner of modelling challenges and even eyesight issues, he's always pressed on. M

Tony recommends Graham Farish figures for their pleasing finish, but is also a fan of Peco figures, which he paints himself.



Factfile: Ashburton, Devon

Ashburton has been the subject of many a layout over the years. Opened in 1872, on the broad gauge South Devon Railway. Passenger services ended in 1958, with goods services following in 1962. The station re-opened as part of the Dart Valley Railway in 1969, but the revival didn't last long.

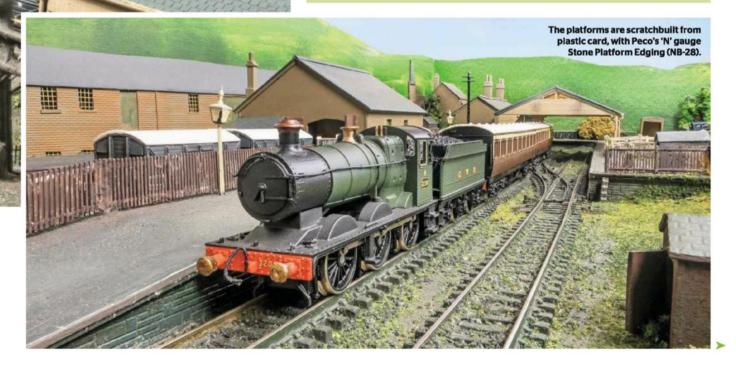
In 1971, the route to Ashburton was severed by the A38 dual carriageway and the station closed once again. The Brunelian trainshed became a garage, but in 2015 plans were proposed to redevelop the area surrounding the station, dashing any hopes of trains ever returning to the town.

However, both Friends of Ashburton Station and the South Devon Railway Trust fought to oppose the plans, and Tony's layout even helped out too.

"I was asked if I'd dust off the layout and take it to a few exhibitions," says Tony. "It was to raise awareness of the station's plight, in the hope that it could be saved."

Redevelopment plans have since been shelved, with Friends of Ashburton Station and the South Devon Railway Trust now seeking to safeguard the station's future.

But it was the thousands of smaller locomotives built by Hunslet, Hudswell Clarke, RSH, Andrew Barclay and others that arguably kept the country moving as they bustled about in mines and factories. These are the so-called 'industrials' and they've traditionally been overlooked as subjects for ready-to-run models.

Hornby broke the mould in 2014 with its Sentinel 4wDH, the first true 'OO' gauge RTR industrial model. It followed this success with its Peckett 0-4-OST, released earlier this year. As with 'OO9', this feels like a market that manufacturers will explore further, especially given that the choice of main line subjects shrinks all the time.

Golden Valley Hobbies should be congratulated for choosing an industrial for its first ready-to-run model. The Herefordshire wholesaler and distributor has commissioned Oxford Rail to produce one of the longest lived and most popular, the Yorkshire Engine Company 'Janus' O-6-ODE.

First impressions of Golden Valley's new model are good, YEC 'Janus' and 'half Janus' designs had a distinctive shape, and GVH has captured it well. It compares well with photographs and a drawing published in Tony Vernon's book Yorkshire Engine Company - Sheffield's Locomotive Manufacturer. The bonnet has the subtle forward taper, the nose corners are almost perfectly shaped and the radiator grille is crowned by that famous 'Yorkshire' badge (which hides the radiator filler cap).

The bonnet handrails feel like wire, whereas those eye-catching side and end rails are a flexible plastic, which is a boon for the clumsy fingered. All grilles and louvres are moulded, but could easily be disguised with some judicial

weathering. The cab shape is good too, although it lacks the curved gutters over the windows. One really neat touch is the hinged rain cap on the exhaust stacks.

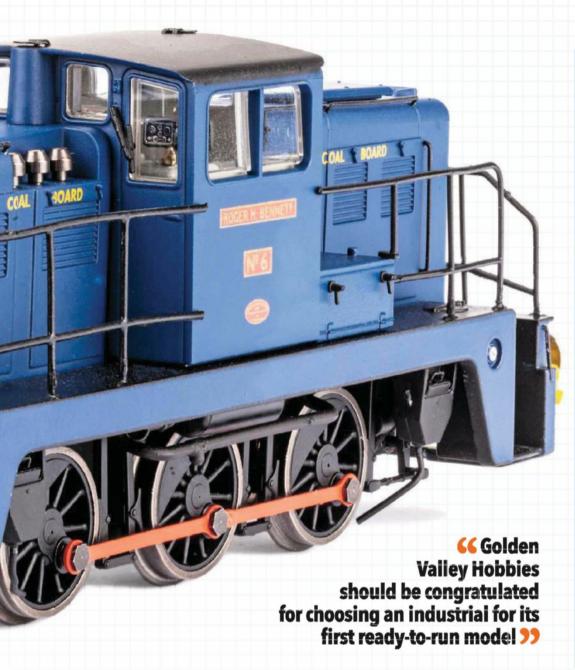
There are some separately fitted parts under the classic YEC running plate. There are air reservoir tanks, pipes and horns, with sand boxes at each end. The 'boxes have wire pipes but they are the wrong shape; presumably this is a compromise to aid construction.

Those deep bufferbeams have an aperture to clear the fixed NEM pocket. Sadly, you don't get a blanking piece to fill the hole. Either side of the aperture are turned metal but unsprung buffers, that are a little on the small side.

A RTR 'OO' gauge locomotive that retails for under £100 is a rare thing nowadays and GVH should be praised for making a model 'for the people'. But if anything, that affordability comes at a cost

DCC ready

GVH and Oxford Rail appear to have studied the Foxfield Railway's Janus 2868 Ludstone, which was built for Shelton Iron & Steel in 1962. This locomotive appears to be one of the very few - it may even be unique - to have corner cut-outs on the bufferbeam. Our sample, however, is finished as National Coal Board No 6 Roger H. Bennett. This locomotive, built for NCB's Littleton Colliery in 1959, is based at the Churnet Valley Railway and was named in honour of Mr Bennett, whose

legacy allowed the locomotive to be saved, in 2008.

GVH has included details - including the bufferbeam cut-outs - that the real 'Roger H. Bennett' doesn't have. The model is also painted blue, whereas the real locomotive carries a black colour scheme. Photographs also suggest that both end radiator grilles are louvred, whereas the GVH has moulded louvres at one end and a moulded grille at the other.

Despite this, the overall livery application is generally good. The blue has a good lustre to it and name and numberplates are well-printed.

Unlike a modern Bachmann or Hornby model, however, the worksplate isn't legible. The finish is let down by a fuzzy edge to the bufferbeam yellow and the lettering isn't straight.

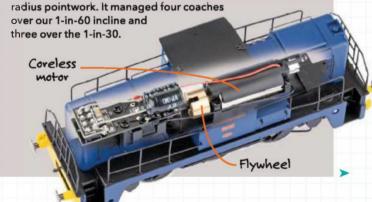
Whether or not the GVH qualifies as a 'great' model depends on your point of view. If you want 100% fidelity and all detail differences catered for, you'd probably be prepared to pay more rather than compromise. But if you want a handsome industrial diesel locomotive model to modern standards, with a smooth mechanism that's DCC-ready too - and that doesn't break the bank - then this is the model for you.

With sound versions available, not to mention numerous colour schemes and a range of complementary Oxford Rail open wagons, Golden Valley's 'Janus' is certainly worth a second look. (RF)

On the test track: GVH 'Janus'

A coreless motor sits under the bonnet. There's a brass flywheel that connects to a gear tower on one axle via a short prop shaft. Our sample was the analogue version and the DCC decoder blanking plate has a capacitor attached to it. This, presumably, acts as a 'stay alive' device.

Whatever goes on under the bonnet, the 'Janus' was beautifully smooth on our test track. It handled 12 Bachmann and Hornby bogie coaches on straight track around our test track, but struggled to pull the same train through tight

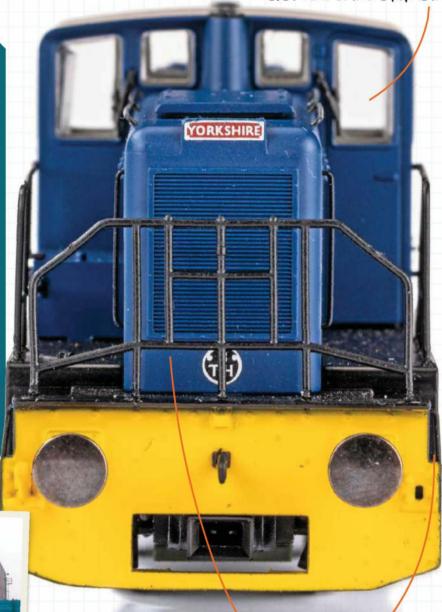
History

Yorkshire Engine Company built 102 'Janus' locomotives between 1956 and 1965. The design was inspired by contemporary North American practice, with an engine and generator either side of the central cab. The two Rolls-Royce engines powered the two end axles respectively. It was a very simple arrangement but it packed a 400hp punch. The name 'Janus' came from the two-faced Roman god.

The first, YEC2594, wowed the press at Appleby Frodingham steel works on April 19 1956. Port of London Authority ordered ten, ICI bought 12 and the National Coal Board had six. Shelton Iron & Steel and Stanton Iron bought three and one respectively but their competitor, United Steel, ordered 65. This is hardly surprising as YEC was a United Steel subsidiary. One potential customer that didn't take up the option was British Railways.

Export orders were limited: one to Jamaica and two to India. However, the 'Janus' inspired several variants: there was the four and six-coupled 'half Janus' and the larger eight-coupled 'Taurus'.

Many locomotives are still in service in industry, while several have now found good homes on preserved railways.

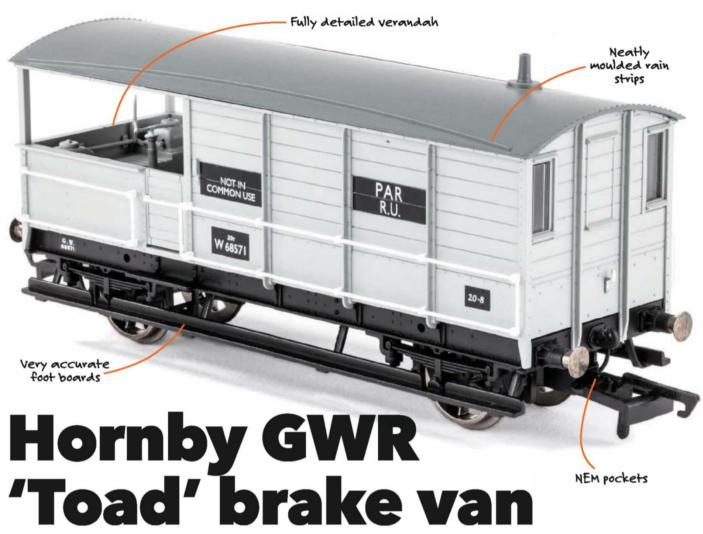

reat Western Railway brake vans carried the telegraphic code 'Toad' and the title has become synonymous with the company's distinctive vans, with their large single end verandah. Nevertheless, within that blanket description there were many variations in shape and weight to cover both lightweight branch goods services and the heavy main line workings, including coal trains from South Wales.

Available ready-to-run, model 'Toads' are somewhat long in the tooth, however. The previous Hornby version had worked its way through the Airfix GMR and Dapol ranges before reaching Hornby, while Bachmann's 'Toad' originated only a little more recently. The most obviously dated feature of both these models is the moulded side handrails. These were a distinctive feature of the 'Toad' design, extending the full length of the vehicle (apart from the door) and enabling guards and shunters to stand safely on the footboards.

Hornby has now released its all-new 'Toad' to replace the ex-Airfix model and it is a fine and inexpensive model of the



Diagram AA15 20-ton version introduced in 1918. The AA15 measured 24ft over the headstocks and was fitted with GWR self-contained buffers and drawgear, which was the reason for the new diagram number.

The bodywork had steel sheeting to the lower bodysides and the verandah. A total of 378 were built to six lot numbers. Vans numbered from 68501-700 had the long footboards hung on brackets of rectangular-section strip, rather than round bar. Some remained in use as departmental vehicles into the early 1980s.

For the first time in ready-torun, both rectangular side handrails are separate mouldings in white plastic. End lamp irons are also separate mouldings, but those on the sides are moulded. Planking and strapping detail on the body is crisp, and the steel-panelled areas have some very fine rivets.

On the open verandah, the sandboxes are fully represented, together with a separately fitted sanding lever mechanism.

A separately fitted lever on the bulkhead operated sanders at the other end of the van. All these fittings are commendably fine, as is the quality of the handbrake standard.

The roof, which is glued in place, has planking detail on the underside plus neatly moulded rainstrips and a stovepipe with an open top. Some have expressed disappointment that the stovepipe is slightly coned (to aid extraction from the mould) but in reality this is hardly noticeable. Both pairs of end windows are glazed and the verandah has a brown, planked floor.

The chassis is fitted with spoked blackened metal wheelsets and pivoted NEM coupler pockets. Bufferheads are turned metal and blackened. Footboards are moulded as a one-piece unit with a very neat attachment into the chassis. They

have the correct rectangular section brackets. The model weighs just 45g.

The BR liveried version is finished in freight stock light grey and neatly printed as W68571, allocated to Par. The solebar is also printed with its GWR registration.

Once again, Hornby has excelled with an essential wagon retooled to the highest standard. A fine model of a hugely popular prototype at a very reasonable price for a modern wagon. (CJL)

instalment: the PBA 'Tiger'
bogie hoppers.

A fleet of 35 PBA hoppers were introduced in 1982. They were built by Fauvet-Girel in France to move clay from Cornwall to processing establishments in Staffordshire and Scotland. They were a forerunner to the many types of large bogie hopper wagon in use on Britain's railways, so it's surprising that the last four vehicles were scrapped a few years ago.

Kindly loaned for review by KMRC is 33 70 9382061-7 in pristine English China Clays/ Tiphook Rail blue. Also available are wagons in ECC white with Tiger branding, while both schemes are also available with a weathered finish for just £5 more per wagon.

First impressions are good, and Kernow's meticulous research and DJModels' production have come together to produce a very good modern wagon. Your eyes are immediately drawn to the wealth of fine printed detail. Maintenance,

loading and operating instructions, data panels and the leasing company branding are all present and correct. Printing is neatly executed throughout, although the Tiphook rail lettering looks a litle fuzzy around the edges upon closer inspection.

Physically, the PBA is a big, imposing wagon designed to make the most of our restricted loading gauge. Body shape and overall appearance are convincing, and are enhanced by the detail at each end.

Kudos to Kernow and DJM for including detail differences between the as-built wagons and those modified for international duties (which includes lashing hooks and eyes). This caused a change in TOPS code from PBA to JIA. Our sample also has twin pipes running along the lower part of the body, whereas original versions have three.

The etched metal walkways at the handbrake end are especially good. Flexible plastic handrails are a sensible option, being both relatively fine and robust enough to withstand repeated handling.

Air-braking equipment and body-strengthening beams are visible below the walkways and at the opposite end of the wagon. These employ a mix of neat plastic mouldings and wire. The locks and levers on the bodyside are moulded, but the prominent handbrake wheels are separate fittings. Hopper cover release gear is also moulded on each end.

Also neatly moulded are the Y25 bogies, with the latter having large brake shoes very close to the wheel on

each side. Detachable tension lock couplings are fitted in NEM pockets attached to the bogie frames, and provide reasonably close coupling.

The large rectangular

buffers are not sprung.
A combination of weight
and free-running metal wheels
with pinpoint axles makes the
'Tiger' a reliable runner. We
marshalled ours between
Bachmann and Hornby bogie
coaches and four-wheeled

wagons and it ran beautifully,

even through first-radius pointwork.

This is yet another excellent china clay-related product from Kernow. It may not quite match the benchmark modern 'OO' gauge wagon (Bachmann's JJA Autoballaster) in terms of refinement, but it is £10 cheaper. It should be a must for the modern modeller - and not just those who model Cornwall's railways. Why not invent a local china clay processing plant to justify a fleet on your layout? (RF)

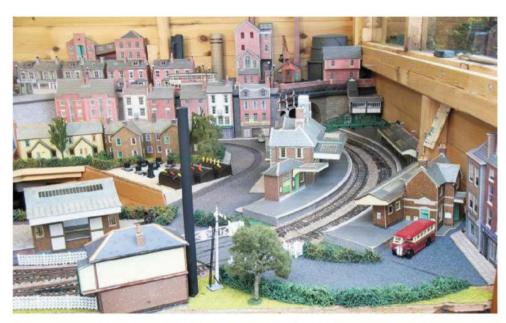

My layout is in a small 7ft by 5ft garden shed. It's not based on any specific location, but it gives me the chance to run steam-hauled trains (plus a few diesels that I like to run). Space is a real problem in such a small area, but there is an upper level that is reached by a branch line, which normally works with a shuttle module.

The lower level is a twin-track 'tail chaser'. I make no apology for this, and yes, an end-to-end layout would have been more prototypically correct, but the length of run would have been far too short for my liking.

There is also a tramway at low level, which runs from the station and past the shops along to a small housing estate. On the upper level, there is a factory and a gas works. Workers also travel by tram, the tramway being supported on a much-modified Hornby Grand Suspension Bridge.

Track is Peco Code 100 (the tramway uses Code 75), my trains are ready-to-run and the buildings are card kits from Metcalfe and Superquick.





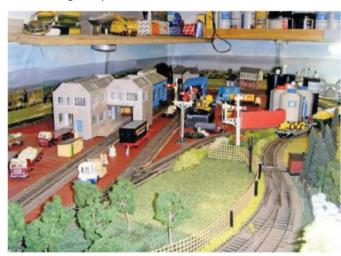


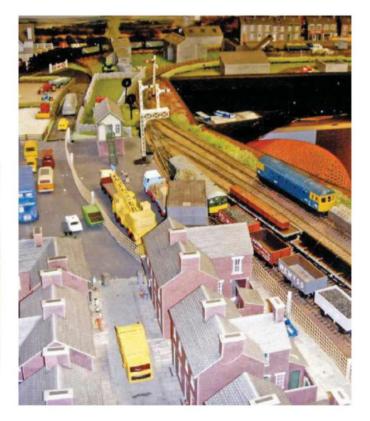
Wired for sound

ROLLING STOCK

CAN I CONVERT A PULLMAN?

My son Fred is a fan of Pullman cars and is really struggling to find a readymade U-type car. Is it possible to convert a steel-bodied Hornby Pullman Third into a U-type?

Alistair Holt, by e-mail

Unfortunately, no. There isn't a straightforward way to convert an existing Hornby Pullman car into another version because the differences are too numerous and some of them are quite subtle. It would require both a new chassis and body to create a U-type car.

Hornby offers some cars in its 'Golden Arrow' anniversary pack, which it's describing as U-type cars. These are not correctly described. They are modelled on standard Pullmans which received some superficial conversions to make them look more like the U-type cars. They received guard's doors and rectangular toilet windows but are



otherwise standard K-type all-steel cars.

The U-type, though newer, reverted to old-style construction with truss underframes and timber-framed bodies.

They also had Gresley bogies - the only Pullmans to have these.

I'm still hopeful that, one day, Hornby will make a proper U-type car! (CJL)

ROLLING STOCK

PAINT JOB

I want to repaint some redundant Mk 3 coaches to match my Hornby Class 67 and DVT and am trying to source suppliers for the right paints and decals to complete the DB/EWS managers' train. Can you point me in the right direction?

As far as I know, Fox Transfers (fox-transfers.co.uk) is the only source of transfers aimed specifically at the managers'/hospitality train locomotives and carriages for the EWS era.

For 'OO', pack F4977/6 includes the main logos for the Class 67 and DVT and pack F4977/7 contains the small stripes, numbers and embellishments for the carriages. Paint-wise, the carriages are a deep, glossy maroon shade, similar to BR maroon, if a tad darker. RailMatch (www.howesmodels.co.uk) or Phoenix Precision's (www.phoenix-paints.co.uk) BR maroon shades are recommended. There's also Humbrol 20 Crimson, that can be darkened slightly with a few drops of dark green or dark grey. (GD)

FILLING THE GAP

Occasionally, when building a kit, a small gap will appear completely on its own and just won't go away. It clearly needs filling, but what do you do if there are fine mouldings, rivets details or similar around that gap? Can you fill it without destroying this detail? (Dave Lowery)

What you will need

TOOLS NEEDED

- Craft knife
- Masking tape
- Modelling filler



Run a scalpel blade along the gap and remove the tape above the moulding revealing the gap, but still masking the moulded detail.



This annoying gap appeared here between a resin moulded end and the top of the brass roof. It's not easy to fill with solder, although I'm still working on that one!



Now you can use a filler or modelling putty to fill the hole and get rid of the gap.



Get a piece of masking tape and cover both the gap and the surrounding area, making sure you push the tape well into the moulded detail.



Once the filler has dried, carefully remove the masking tape revealing the unmarked moulded details and the filled-in gap. Apply primer, then the final paint. Job done.

WHERE CAN I BUY THIS BARGE?

I recently saw a photograph of a barge in *Model Rail's* 2015 *How To Build A Model Railway* publication (p64), and wondered if it was commercially available?

I'm building a range of sectional dioramas showing the operations of railways on the Western Front during the First World War, from the casualty clearing station and rest camps, through gun lines and light railways, to the trench tramways. I'm keen to include a barge operated by the Royal Engineers, because my great-grandfather served as one of its civil engineer officers at Richborough Military Port, Kent, and on the staff of Field Marshal Haig's GHQ. The bow of the barge shown in the magazine seems to match the profile of those used by the Inland Water Transport.
