# HATTON'S GETS INDUSTRIOUS

atton's already extensive range of exclusive, ready-to-run models got bigger during August, but the two new locomotives it unveiled are some of the smallest offered in 'OO': the South Eastern & Chatham Railway 'P' O-6-OT and an Andrew Barclay O-4-OST. Development work has been under way for a while, as both models are already at the working sample stage.

The SECR built eight 'Ps' between 1909 and 1910 for branch line and push-pull work, but they found a new calling as shunters. They were withdrawn by BR between 1955 and 1961, but half the class have been preserved (two being purchased by industrial users before they were preserved). The model's 'spec' list is impressive, including 'short' and 'tall' tanks and cabs, different buffers and two different types of rivets on the smokebox.

Hatton's has also tooled two versions of Andrew Barclay's classic O-4-OST: those with 14in diameter cylinders and the 16in version, with extended frames. Again, the spec and attention to detail is impressive; Hatton's has tooled different cab profiles, 'short' or 'tall' water tanks, two types of buffers (heads and shanks!) and even two different spring heights.

Both models have five-pole motors and six-pin DCC sockets. However, only the 'P' has enough space for a sound speaker.

## **OO WORKS' IRISH RETURN**

O Works is to produce one of Ireland's best-loved steam locomotives, the Great Southern & Western Railway '101' O-6-O. Arguably better known by its CIÉ classification 'J15', some 111 '101s' were built between 1866 and 1903, making them the most

numerous Irish locomotive of all time. The last were withdrawn at the end of steam on CIÉ in 1962/63 and two, Nos. 184 and 186, were saved by the Railway Preservation Society of Ireland.

The two survivors are remarkably different: No. 186 is fitted with a superheated boiler and Belpaire firebox and is also

paired with a larger tender; No. 184 sports the early, saturated round-topped boiler and has the smaller, outside frame tender, and it is this version that the OO Works model represents.

The model will have an all-metal body and OO Works' new high-torque M05 coreless

motor. They will be offered in either black or grey livery, with decal sheets supplied with different numbers and logos.



#### New kid on the block

There's a new name on Britain's railways: South Western Railway. SWR took over the South Western franchise from South West Trains - operated by Stagecoach since 1996 - on August 20. SWR is a joint First Group/MTR operation. The first trains were worked by 455702 and 455705 in SWT red/orange/blue, but with SWR lettering. SWR will re-introduce stored Class 442s and will send the new Class 707s off-lease.

#### ■ Chinook takes to the rails

GBRf has given its 66723 Chinook a new look: it's carried the name since 2008, but the locomotive now carries a silhouette of one the distinctive tandem rotor helicopters on its bodyside and the RAF Ensign on the cabside. The RAF-style serial number on the bodyside is fictitious and combines the 'ZA' of the Chinook fleet and the last three digits of the locomotive's TOPS number.

#### ▲ Mk 5s on the move

The first five Mk 5 coaches have moved from CAF's Spanish factory to the Velim test track in the Czech Republic. CAF is building 75 Mk 5 coaches for Caledonian Sleeper to replace the ageing Mk 2 and Mk 3 sleepers currently in use. CAF will build more Mk 5a coaches for TransPennine Express. Caledonian Sleeper's Mk 5s are due to arrive in Britain in November, and the first are due to enter service in April 2018.

#### Dave's Modelling Tip

With the amount of spraying I do, little accidents are bound to happen. The worst of which was when I dropped a model that had just been sprayed! All sorts of rubbish stuck to the wet paint.

If this happens to you, do not attempt to remedy it straight away. Just put it down and let it dry. When thoroughly dry, remove any bits stuck to it. Any scars on the paint can be rubbed down with fine wet and dry and then resprayed.

#### ■ A touch of the Canadian

Maunsell 'Schools' Repton has returned to steam at the North Yorkshire Moors Railway in Southern Railway olive green, the first time that the locomotive has carried this livery in service since it returned to UK in 1989. To recreate the locomotive, you'll need to deepen the tender raves on the Hornby - or Dapol - model, a modification made when Repton worked in Nova Scotia in the 1970s. Luckily, you don't have to add cowcatchers and buckeye couplers.

#### ■ Alston's new look

The branch terminus at Alston was known for its trainshed over the run-round loop, which was demolished in the 1960s. Now, the South Tynedale Railway, the 2ft gauge railway built on 41/2 miles of the old Haltwhistle-Alston branch - has built a replacement. It's not an exact replica, but it does give the STR a grand headquarters from which to push towards re-opening the whole line. Do more, see more: Learn more about the

#### Jurassic at the park

Ex-Southam Cement Works Peckett 0-6-0ST No. 1008/03 Jurassic has returned to steam at the Lincolnshire Coast Light Railway, based in Skegness' Water Leisure Park complex. South Cement Works ordered six of these handsome 1ft 9in gauge locomotives from Peckett between 1903 and 1923, and four survive: Jurassic, Triassic, Mesozoic plus Liassic, which took on the name from one of the locomotives scrapped in 1943. 
## SENTINEL MOLLY - THE FULL STORY

We chose War Department khaki and 'WD' lettering for our limited edition Sentinel 4wVBT Molly (MR-017) based on the evidence or rather lack of it - we had to hand at the time. However, reader Nigel Attwood, who is also the editor of the World War Two Railway Study Group bulletin, has been able to fill in the gaps in Molly's story.

Says Nigel, "[Molly] was a Sentinel CEDG, a hybrid between the chain-driven 'Y1' and the two-speed shaft-driven 'Y3', and, to further confuse matters, it was built with an 8ft wheelbase, as opposed to the 7ft one used on the LNER series. There are two obvious detail changes, other than the length: the first being the two open hatches at the back of the coal bunkers and the other being that the water tank hatch is rotated through 90°.

"On leaving the works, the colour scheme was dark green gloss with black lining for the body, matt black underframe and gloss black bufferbeams with white lining. You will note that the Army got rid of the lining quite quickly after arrival.

"The WD order states:
'Loco to be painted with
two coats Lead colour, two
coats approved colour,
lined and varnished.
Under carriage to be
painted Black. Cab etc.,
Dark Green. The letters



## According to Chris...

As *Model Rail* reaches its 20th birthday, **Chris Leigh** looks back at how it all started, and the first of several model-making superstars who ensured its success.

t's difficult to believe that it has been two decades since we launched *Model Rail* in autumn 1997. Back in the 1980s, the 'big three' model railway magazines had dropped to just two, with the closure of *Model Railway Constructor*, of which I was editor. I then became managing editor of all the Ian Allan magazines but, essentially, I was just a progress chaser. In 1992 I was thrown a lifeline, being invited to Peterborough to edit *Steam World*. But that was only part of the plan. It was my experience in railway modelling that was also of interest.

Fast forward to 1996, and when *RAIL* realigned to the professional segment of the railway market, there was no place for its railway modelling supplement, which Dave Lowery and I had produced for half a dozen issues. Now, as publishers, we had to be either in model railways or out. We wanted to be in. I was given a blank 96-page magazine 'dummy' and asked what I thought modellers would want to see in it.

We drew up ideas and artwork. We were going to break the mould and do things differently to the traditional model railway titles. We took ideas from some of the company's other successful magazines. *Garden Answers*, for instance, had useful 'how to' features illustrated with step-by-step photographs and diagrams. Most magazines were as much about the people as the hardware, but model railway

We didn't take nearly enough photographs on our first visit to 'Tetleys Mills', and in those days they were colour slides. Here's one of the unused alternatives from that original visit. NEIL HEPWORTH magazines had always featured models and

layouts and made little of the people who built them. By seeking out layouts that never left home, in preference to exhibition layouts, we sought to highlight the people behind them.

Some of the ideas weren't adopted. There was a pretty *avant-garde* piece of cover artwork, and a proposed cover photograph of me holding an 'O' gauge locomotive like it was a prize-winning fish! Well, the company had lots of experience in successful angling magazines, but little in railway modelling.

Quite by chance, a 'copper' from Stamford sent in some pictures of his layout. "I know you don't do a modelling magazine," he wrote, "but I just wondered if my layout might be of interest?" He was the desk sergeant from Stamford 'nick'. His name was Dave Shakespeare and his layout was 'Tetleys Mills'. We featured it as the first 'Layout that never leaves home' in *Model Rail* and kept going back for more.

It's said that only the good die young. That was certainly true in Dave's case as, all too soon, he passed away from cancer. By then, he and his layout were household names and he was recognised as one of the great layout builders. He had certainly helped make that first issue of *Model Rail* a success.

## **MODELLING LIVES**

Tales from the miniature world.



**James Lavery** reflects on the joys of hanging around railway stations and watching the world go by.

n the early days of our courtship, my wifeto-be asked what I enjoyed most. Never one for thinking on my feet, I blurted something out about sitting on public benches, watching life go by. Now, things could have gone

either way there but, before being branded as a wastrel,

I swiftly expanded on my answer, stating how compelling real life can be. That's one of the reasons I still enjoy hanging around railway stations all these years later.

Sure, I like trains, especially grumbly old diesels and shiny steam locomotives. There's also the endless possibilities offered by these travel

machines, as they pull up and invitingly open their doors. Who can possibly resist the impulse to jump aboard and head for destinations as intriguing as Ballasalla, Sugar Loaf, Aspatria, Luxulyan or Meols Cop.

Observing people at work is fascinating. Watching railway staff go about their work, small cogs in a vast machine, keeping everything ticking over. Invisible disruptions in far-flung places having knock-on effects hundreds of miles down the line; people trying to get from one place to another, sometimes against the odds.

Then there's the travelling public. Where are they all going? Where have they been? What do they do? Are they happy? Who's waiting for them at the other end?

MODELLER'S CV

James Lavery is a furniture designer, artist and writer. Originally from County Kerry, Ireland, he's now based in Liverpool and has been an active modeller for as long as he can remember.

I sit there with a thousand unasked, unanswered questions. All this idle speculation is great for passing the time. I picked up the habit years ago, commuting from one out-of-the-way place to another, with long waits between connecting trains and buses.

What would drive the impatient mad provided endless inspiration for my 'day job'. It has also proved invaluable for my model-making, too. Art college taught me how to 'see', to look for those small details of light, shade, texture and composition. The same skill applies to models which, after all, are three-

dimensional artworks.

Most of the best layouts appear like a snapshot; a moment in time captured forever. Again, it's not just about the trains.

It's the colours and shades. It's the built environment, captured in gritty detail, down to the smallest signs, adverts, litter, newspapers on sale

with contemporary headlines. It's also the human aspect: people in believable poses, the right clothes, doing believable things and, above all, looking like they belong there.

It's these little details that are difficult to get right, but they help to create the overall picture. So, next time you're waiting at a station, take a closer look at everyday things we take for granted. Things we see so often that they become invisible. If looking into the past, study photographs that bit more, looking beyond the buildings and the trains, for the smaller, less obvious elements.

Oh, and if you see a big fellow staring at you from a station bench, don't worry. It might just be me watching the world go by.

Paul Toulmin found out that the rafters in his loft space provided the perfect framework around which to build a model railway.

ig model railways can be difficult to accommodate in our homes, and sometimes we have to adapt the space we have. But it's easy to fall into the trap of putting the job off for years before finally plucking up the courage, time and energy to convert a loft or renovate a spare room. And, all too often, it never happens at all...

If any of that sounds at all familiar (it certainly does to me), then perhaps Paul Toulmin's 'Exeter Junction' can inspire you to finally bite the bullet. Not only is it an attractive layout, it's beautifully

presented within a comfortable and dedicated loft space that Paul converted himself.

#### IN LOFTS WE TRUSS

"I converted the loft about four years ago," says Paul. "It's 25ft long and took me a year - a real labour of love. I used 75mm insulation board, left a small gap, and then covered it with plasterboard. I've found it to be cool in the summer and warm in the winter - no heating required.

Some might have been put off by the centrally positioned trusses, but Paul cleverly used them to his advantage. The layout actually sits across the roof trusses, which have been reinforced with wooden cross members. As Paul says himself: "It's given the layout a really nice height." It also means that virtually all standing space is left clear, with the railway only occupying areas that are too cramped for any other purpose.

#### **MEMORY BANK**

'Exeter Junction's' representation of the BR blue era is something of a homage to Paul's memories of the railway as a child. He grew up in the North West and started spotting on the West Coast Main Line in 1974. "I really enjoyed wandering down to the Western Region to watch the diesel-hydraulics," he says. "BR blue is my era, really. I can remember hoping to find 'Western' numberplates at Swindon, only to get chased away by staff!">





Track that carries lots of stationary locomotives has been weathered more.

What makes this layout great?



There's a real sense of time and place here. There's no kaleidoscope of colour that you find on some layouts, just a subtly weathered fleet of BR blue, with the last knockings of green. Railway infrastructure is well observed too: prototypical semaphore signals and track still to steam era standards. Not experiencing this era first-hand, everything about this layout matches photographs I've seen of the late 1960s/early 1970s.

#### LAYOUT **EXETER JUNCTION**

The layout itself is freelance, but Paul had devised a concise wish list of requirements before he laid any track. He explains: "I wanted at least two or three through platforms, a bay platform in which to store units and parcel vans, and a small depot. It was a case of mocking up the layout with loose bits of track and buildings until I was happy."

Since the *Model Rail* photo shoot, Paul has extended 'Exeter Junction' into a full oval, and his knack for speedy model making isn't surprising. Paul is a driver for a main line operator, which certainly gives him a head start when it comes to research and real-world observation. On his main line travels, he's paid particular attention to signals.


"I've tried to space them out fairly realistically," he says. "I have paid particular attention to their height; a signal that controls a bay won't be the same height as a signal on the main line."

Operation is something that Paul enjoys and he has spent lots of time formulating a track plan to suit. He explains the process: "I laid all the track - every single piece. Once I was happy with it, and it had been tested, I airbrushed the track. I used Phoenix Paints Rusty Rails (P977), which is a great colour. I airbrushed that over the whole lot before wiping it from the top of the rails."

Operation is kept interesting, thanks to ample opportunity to engage in locomotive changes.







Central trusses can restrict standing room, but Paul has used them to his advantage. By constructing 'Exeter Junction' on top of the trusses, the obstacle has been turned into an opportunity.






The addition of cross members has strengthened the trusses, while providing the perfect platform on which to create a flat surface with sheets of plywood.




This forms a solid base on which to place baseboards. Best of all, the standing space in front of each truss is kept entirely clear, so you don't actually lose any space and there's ample storage room beneath the layout too.

#### **THINGS YOU MAY HAVE MISSED**














"The locomotive changes I used to see during my spotting days were really slick," says Paul. "They'd do it in minutes. It's a case of bringing the replacement off-shed and placing it in a good position. The trick is to swap the two locomotives over without any conflicting manoeuvres. The track plan reflects this and allows me to have several locomotives waiting in the wings."

#### WHATEVER THE WEATHER

'Exeter Junction' is DCC and many of Paul's locomotives are sound-fitted. He's planning to add sound decoders to the rest of his fleet in the future. Each locomotive is ready-to-run and weathered by Paul, who's developed a strict weathering regime.

"I like to take my time and will have sessions with my airbrush and compressor in the garage. I find working in batches works well.

"I also use the Internet for research purposes, before I start any weathering work - finding out as much as I can about the condition of what I'm working on. Weathering is important, I think it would be a shame to go to all that trouble - weathering buildings and adding weeds here and there - only to have shiny, pristine locomotives. And I find it quite therapeutic!"

Despite enjoying it now, Paul does admit that he was a little nervous when he first started weathering. "It was nerve-racking at first," he admits. "I went through my older stock first and, once I got used to the process, moved onto the more expensive models. At some point, you just have to bite the bullet."

Paul is a fan of RailMatch paints, and uses several >




Many of the buildings are Bachmann Scenecraft and Hornby Skaledale, weathered to make them look more realistic. shades in particular: "I use Sleeper Grime (1406) and Roof Dirt (2403) on the running gear. Then I'll use Brake Dust (2416) to weather the bogies, which really brings out the detail."


Observation is certainly key when weathering, and Paul follows one key principle. "Weathering is never flat," he says. "It's about using varying shades to bring the model to life. I'm weathering wagons at the moment - you can really go to town on them. I like to

use a little thinner to finish them off, treating the printed details. I'll also clean up handrails and locomotive doors to portray the wear you get from crew handling and brushing past them."

#### MASTER OF MOTIVATION

It's been four years since Paul started his loft conversion and the hard work has certainly paid off. 'Exeter Junction' is housed within a comfortable,









dedicated railway room that will preserve the layout for years.

Converting the loft single-handed might not have been the easiest process in the world but it's almost certainly reduced the number of potential problems Paul will face in the future. And that can only mean one thing: more time playing trains!

#### **MODELLER CV: PAUL TOULMIN**

I started trainspotting in 1974, with many of my friends. This coincided with the electrification of the West Coast Main Line, so we had school visits from railway staff which furthered my interest. 




# WOODHEAD

Paul A. Lunn introduces a new series - layout ideas based on some of the most dramatic railways in the British Isles.

Part 1: England

he British Isles are blessed with some really stunning scenic vistas, be they natural or even man-made. Over the next few issues, I'm going to bring you some layout designs based on the most dramatic railways in England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland.

We start with England. Crossing the rugged, beautiful Pennines resulted in some incredibly dramatic stretches of railway, and I could have chosen Matlock-Buxton, the Stainmore Route, even the Settle & Carlisle.

Instead, I opted for my personal favourite: the ex-Great Central line from Manchester London Road and Sheffield Victoria, with a further stretch heading north to the large marshalling yards at Wath. It was steeply graded and punched its way through the Pennines with tunnels near the settlement at Woodhead that would give the line its nickname.

Coal traffic was heavy and steam struggled to cope with the line's demands, so the LNER implemented plans to electrify it using the Dutch 1,500V DC system. Work was completed after the Second World War. The line was best known for its 'EM1' Bo+Bos

and 'EM2' Co-Cos (later Class 76s and Class 77s).

The Beeching Report proposed its closure, but it was retained as a freight-only line from January 5 1970; the Class 77s used on passenger duties were sold to Nederlandse Spoorwegen. It was the combined age of the 1,500V DC catenary and the Class 76s, together with the fact that BR had standardised on 25kV AC, and compounded by the decline in freight traffic that led to the final closure of the Manchester-Sheffield-Wath electric railway on July 18 1981.

Short sections of the line remain open, including a spur through Deepcar station, near Sheffield, that serves Liberty Speciality Steels' Stocksbridge works. There's also a spur at the Manchester end that terminates at Hadfield, where the original 1,500V DC masts have been converted to carry 25kV AC wires.

Capturing the scenic essence of the line is paramount, and a visit to the now-defunct trackside is recommended, particularly those remote locations where the landscape hasn't changed much.
Whatever type of layout you choose, the inclusion of some or all essential Woodhead features will certainly pay dividends.

Above: A pair of 'EM1s', hauling a rake of merry-goround hoppers, ply their way through the exchange sidings. Foreground tracks lead to the lower, rugged scenic section, wherea those behind the signal box lead up to a fiddleyard. Exchange sidings provide an opportunity for changing motive power from electric to diesel and vice versa, or adding/removing banking locomotives, not to mention a modest amount of shunting.

# Woodhead starter layout

This is for the first-time Woodhead builder. It measures 6ft by 4ft 4in and has no gradients or dropped sections, with all scenery built upwards from the baseboard.

It comprises two scenes; one inspired by Woodhead, the other a contrived, self-contained industrial facility, with a privately owned shunter, for added operational potential. Contoured hills with rocky outcrops, and conveyors act as a dividing backscene. You will require external access to the tunnel interior. It includes a scenic four-track fiddleyard, which can double as a set of exchange sidings.



# Modelling the catenary

One of the reasons why the Woodhead line was special was that it was one of the first main lines to receive overhead wires. Sometimes you can get away with ignoring the catenary, but not in this case. For instant results, modellers might want to use Peco LC-100 or Dapol's OOCAT 1 and OO WIRE1. However, the 1,500V DC system used distinctive portals, so some work is needed to replicate the Woodhead look.

I can't help but feel that Dapol's C017 Signal Gantry would make an ideal multi-track OHLE portal, either on a cosmetic basis or with Peco or Dapol fixings grafted on.

Advanced modellers might opt to build a more accurate version, using the ranges of UK and continental components. Either way, an understanding of the equipment is likely to provide us with a more accurate representation. The British Transport Commission book below is packed with useful information - here are a few examples.

• Overhead line equipment comprises a contact wire suspended by droppers from an auxiliary catenary which itself is hung from a main catenary wire also by droppers. The catenary is supported by insulators attached to steel structures, normally spaced 210ft apart, approximately 33½ in in 'OO' gauge, and will require reduction in model form. At curves, and where special track conditions exist, the structure spacing is reduced. One such set of overhead line equipment is provided throughout for each electrified line. At sidings, the auxiliary catenary is



omitted and the contact wire is suspended direct from the main catenary.


- Normal height of the contact wire is 16ft above rail level, a little over 2½ in in 'OO' gauge, but is decreased at overbridges and other low structures to 13ft 9in and increased to 18ft at public road level crossings, and to 20ft in certain sidings and at water columns.
- The contact wire is 'staggered' very slightly at overhead structures, on straight track on alternate sides of the centre line, in order to maintain a smooth surface and prevent grooving of the pantograph's contact surface.
- Knuckles are fitted where two overhead lines meet at an angle, such as a point, and allow locomotives to pass smoothly

without interrupting the circuit in the transition from one contact wire to another. Knuckles can be insulated or left bare.

- There are overlapping spans of overhead line equipment between the end of one and the commencement of another over the same track, allowing smooth movement of locomotives from one section to another.
- Sub-stations and track sectioning cabins, mentioned for their scenic value, contain equipment for converting alternating current to direct current and for feeding and isolating the overhead line. Current returns through the locomotive's wheels via the running rails and back to the sub-station through negative feeder cables.

# **ROUTE LEARNING**

This pull-out schematic map from the Working Instructions handbook shows the route and adjoining lines, track sectioning, sub-stations and location names. Interestingly enough, the notorious Worsborough Incline, sometimes referred to as Worsborough bank, approximately three miles at 1-in-40 from Wentworth Junction at the bottom to West Silkstone Junction at the top, has been omitted! # **Ultimate Woodhead plan**

This 14ft by 8ft 'OO' gauge layout features a 'figure of eight' on a layout that would suit a spare room or a loft. It comprises two discrete scenes, including exchange sidings, a scenic stretch, gradients, a tunnel and a fiddleyard. The gradients are as follows; A to B at 1-in-48, dropping 1½in over 6ft and C to D at 1-in-48 (rising 1½in over 6ft to give a clearance of 3in.

The fiddleyard is at a slightly higher level, accessed from behind a removable backscene, which helps when cleaning and carrying out maintenance, or providing additional access to the rear, which will require a minimum walkway of 2ft 6in, so you'll need a room that's actually 10ft 6in wide.

This scheme is for those who want to watch trains in the landscape. Going for DCC would be the best option, particularly for banking and double-headed operations. You could be flexible with your time period, mixing steam and electric together, or going completely modern image. Even with the latter, there's the choice of the immediate post-steam period with both passenger and freight traffic, or opting for purely freight.





# See it for yourself

Much of the Woodhead Route's trackbed has been turned into footpaths, most notably the Trans Pennine and Longdendale Trails. Four classic Woodhead Route locomotives have been preserved: Class 76 26020 (76020) at the National Railway Museum; Class 77s 27000 Electra at the Midland Railway-Butterley, 27001 Ariadne at the Museum of Science & Industry in Manchester, and 27003 Diana, preserved in the Netherlands by Workgroup Loc 1501.



# This time it's

VITAL STATS Layout: West Coast -**Size:** 30ft by 11ft

Gauge: 'N'

After years of club service, **Andy Armitage** started a personal project that would test his decades of modelling experience.



30ft by 11ft layout in 'OO' is a sizeable project, but in 'N' gauge, it's positively gigantic. In fact, Andy Armitage's 'West Coast - Southern Section' ['WC-SS'] is so vast, he's managed to depict three classic West Coast Main Line locations - Watford Junction, Harrow & Wealdstone and Linslade.

Having been very involved in the club scene for a number of years ('Kings Park' *GBMR Vol. 5*), Andy thought it was high time he focused on his own project. But with a 32ft by 11ft loft space, he no longer had to worry about the space restrictions that had plagued his earlier layouts - the very reason he had switched from Hornby Dublo to 'TT' to Minitrix 'N' in the first place.

Andy was originally presented with two feasible options as far as housing 'WC-SS': his loft or garage. He explains why he chose the former: "The garage was a bit damp and I found it to be either too hot or too cold."

The loft was part of a house extension, so Andy had the luxury of overseeing its construction. "I could see its potential as it was being built," he says. "The rafters were positioned well and the builders installed some windows, which made the build even better."

The windows are south-facing, which Andy attributes to the good ventilation during the summer, and the room also contains a radiator, keeping it warm during the winter. Looking back, there's another reason why Andy chose to stick with the loft: "My wife would certainly agree that it keeps the railway out of the household," he laughs. "It's a room that's entirely dedicated to my hobby and is not in anyone's way, so it doesn't get knocked either."

# **GAME PLAN**

'WC-SS' started life as little more than an idea in Andy's head. He first started to realise the project with pen and paper. He explains: "I produced a shortlist of the places I deemed quintessential to the location and era of the layout. By that time, I had already decided the layout would reside in the loft, so I had an idea of the space I was working with."

The unfinished loft extension didn't stop Andy from starting on the layout. He decided to start work on the many buildings he would need. Around 70% of the buildings he had collected from past layouts had been donated to his club's 'Kings Park' project, so he had *a lot* of work to do.

The time prior to working in the loft proved







# What makes this layout great?



Bigger doesn't always mean better, but it's hard not to marvel at 'WC-SS's' size. The fiddleyard alone is a track planning work of art, and that's before you realise that much of it is automated. Perhaps my favourite thing about 'WC-SS' is Andy's love of scratchbuilding stock. It's unusual to see a layout this big that's populated with so many hand-built trains. The layout certainly isn't lacking in character.

fruitful, as Andy managed to build Harrow & Wealdstone station - complete with footbridge - and the station buildings at Watford Junction - including the power signal box.

Despite 'WC-SS's' large size, the decision to model so many locations left Andy with the task of compressing each section accordingly. He explains: "The track plan isn't geographically correct as far as running order is concerned. I've had to fit the stations and surrounding scenery where I could. That said, all trains still run from north to south or south to north, even if they don't traverse exactly the right area."

The Underground sections run independently from the four main lines. "The Underground is laid out in a more prototypical manner," says Andy. "They come from the south, moving through Harrow & Wealdstone station, and then Watford Junction."

Heathcote-Electronics' automated modules operate each main line independently. Connected to the main line is a huge network of sidings, once a train has finished its duties, the automated system will move onto the next siding. This affords Andy the luxury of multiple trains running, without the need for manual operation - perfect when relaxing or focusing on trickier, manual areas of operation.

# GOING UNDERGROUND


"The Underground section started as a gimmick on one of the 'N' gauge exhibition layouts I was involved in," Andy admits. "I made a 1938 Stock set, which I eventually motorised. This led to the concept of 'Kings Park' and as time went on, I built two more 1938 Stock sets, a 1959 Stock set, and a 1972 Stock set."


Each scratchbuilt Bakerloo Line train is made from plastic card and resin roofs from BH Enterprises. Scratchbuilding stock (especially in such a small scale) can be time consuming and tedious, Andy recalls his method: "I'd mark the windows out, drill a hole in each and then file them individually. It's a long and laborious process."

ed it various shades of blue. I then built the banks up using balsa wood before adding Woodland Scenics' Realistic Water (C1211)."

The Realistic Water soaked into the ballast and cured to form a slight ripple effect. Andy followed this with a second coating of Realistic Water, but it appeared to dry flat...

"I was happy enough with the result, but remarkably, it conformed to the ripples of the first coat overnight as it cured," says Andy. "When it dried, it looked much better than I ever thought it would, so I was really quite lucky."



It's not just Underground stock that's received the scratchbuild treatment. Andy has built departmental stock, fashioned from brass etched sides and leftover Minitrix coaches. He's also created an AC Electric fleet. "I've built Classes 81 to 85, using Minitrix Type 2 chassis and 'Warship' bogies, with Graham Farish '87' body shells - I used a file to remove the side detail and changed the front ends using plastic card.

'WC-SS' also features several celebrity locomotives, including prototype diesels *Kestrel* and 53 *Falcon*. Andy recalls both builds: "They're resin kits. *Kestrel* was from Silver Fox, I think, and fitted onto a Farish '47' chassis."



# LONG TIME COMING

No wonder feline companion Ralph is always waiting to get in on the action!


"He's never actually broken anything, although he has got onto the layout once or twice. That said, he manages to step around anything of importance - leaving only a couple of bent speed restriction signs."




# **MODELLER CV:** ANDY ARMITAGE

I got into railways mainly because I'm a fourth generation railwayman, and railways have always been a part of my life. I was about seven or eight when I started model making in 'OO', and I've been dabbling ever since. There have been periods when I didn't have a layout, but even then I used the time to

scratchbuild locomotives and rolling stock (The five original D600 series 'Warships' (Nos. D600-D604), and various diesel prototypes are my favourites).

In the early 1990s, I got involved in my local N Gauge Society Area Group, which was a great way to learn lots of new

'WC-SS's' control panels are almost as impressively vast as the layout itself. Andy attributes such attention to detail to first-hand experience.

"I went to work on the real railway in the 1970s," he recalls. "My first job was a 'Box Boy' (doing train announcements from a signal box), which is how I got interested in signalling -I had a magnificent view of London St Pancras!

"The main panels are 2in by 1in timber, I used hardboard for the front and base (painted matt grey). I then outlined the track diagram in pencil before marking it out properly with coloured tape. I then made some labels on the computer, which I printed and stuck to the diagram where desired. To prevent damage, I covered the diagram with clear plastic sheet. Finally, holes were drilled to house switches and LEDs."

Andy notes that the layout features largely four-aspect signals (with the odd two and three-aspect signal). Interestingly, the signal modules were salvaged from a garden layout that he built 30 years ago - not bad going!

techniques. I then worked on a layout called 'Redbury' for around six years, where I scratchbuilt many of the station buildings. After that, I was involved in 'Kings Park' for ten years before I got a bit too old to lug baseboards around, and settled into my own project.





# TRACK LAYING **FUNDAMENTALS**

George Dent offers a foundation course in achieving perfect rail joints and the most effective ways of fixing track to the baseboard.

nless we're building a layout designed around sectional track and turnouts, it's likely that we'll need to cut and join rails. This is a stage in layout building that demands care and accuracy.

Not only must electrical continuity be maintained, but a good-fitting joint will also avoid wear to rolling stock wheels and reduce the build-up of dirt and oxidation on the rails. Smooth rail heads are crucial, as is a square face to the cut rail, allowing the joiner to slide easily onto the rail and to mate successfully with the other length of rail without an unseemly gap.

Special track cutting shears are available and these speed the job along, taking away much of the physical labour involved in



sawing hard metal rails. However, shears must be followed up with a file and abrasive paper to effect a satisfactory edge. A junior hacksaw or razor saw - with a sharp and true blade - are cheaper options, but the rails must be firmly supported while cutting, lest the plastic rail. chairs be weakened or broken by the pressure of the saw blade.

Reliable and smooth track requires a patient and methodical approach, and time spent getting this area of a layout right first time will not only save the headaches of later repairs, but will provide a more satisfying model railway to operate.



# An important point

When planning your track layout, remember to keep points away from any baseboard cross members if they're to be operated by point motors mounted beneath the boards.

# Tools needed

Long-nose pliers

# Laying the foundations

When setting out the full-size track plan, we need to check that adjacent lines have adequate clearance to prevent passing trains from colliding, especially on corners. The typical scale distance between the rails of adjacent tracks is six feet.

However, the bodies of longer vehicles - and those fitted with bogies - tend to swing outwards on curves, creating an overhang in the centre. As a result, curved tracks need to be set slightly further apart.

Ready-made spacing gauges are cheap and freely available (from Peco, for example), or you can make your own from card. A good way of checking the swing and overhang is to take one of your longest carriages and fix one pencil to the centre and another to one end. Push the vehicle around the bend on the inside track, checking that the pencils are describing the necessary clearance profile for this set of rails. Flip the carriage round to draw the swing profile on the other side of the same track.

Now place the carriage on the outer rails, moving the tracks apart until the profile lines remain separate. The same process is useful for checking clearances for platforms, bridges and tunnels.



# **UNDERLYING ISSUES**

While track can be fixed directly to a timber baseboard, it will create a noisy layout as the trains rattle over the rail joints. The layout will also appear rather 'flat', as track is often raised slightly from the surrounding land to ensure efficient drainage.

Therefore, laying track onto a soft underlay both reduces noise and raises the track to a realistic level. Cork has been a popular choice of underlay for decades, although foam board is also suitable. Pre-formed ballast-effect foam underlays are also available to suit proprietary track systems.



Plastic gauges are available to help ensure the correct spacing of adjacent tracks. This red Peco gauge features spacers for straight and curved sections. Homemade alternatives are possible, cut from thick card.



Tracks usually have to be set further apart on curves, especially on tight radii. Tacking a pencil to the centre and end of your longest carriage reveals the degree of swing and overhang on each side. Repeat on each track.



Rolls of thin cork are available from model shops, offering an effective and efficient option. To elevate the tracks further, try cork floor tiles, which are thicker. Tiles are especially useful for 'OO' and 'O' gauge layouts.



Cut the cork strip or tiles with a sharp, stout knife and metal straightedge. Angle the blade to form a chamfered edge on the outside of the track bed, which helps us to form an authentic ballast 'shoulder'.



A feature of post-1960s main lines is higher 'shoulders' of ballast. Replicate this by elevating the track on multiple layers of cork. Cut and chamfer extra strips to sit either side of the tracks to form shoulders and save on ballast.



A quicker solution is the use of pre-coloured, textured foam ballast underlay. This is designed to match commercial track systems by the likes of Peco and Hornby. It can be laid in seconds, with no need for painting or ballasting.

# **Get connected**

Rail joiners - or fishplates - join lengths of track together. They may be pre-fitted to sectional track, but for flexible track and points you'll need to buy packs separately. To make a good, neat joint, it's best to remove one or two moulded chairs from the sleepers, to allow the fishplate to slide into place without pushing the rails upwards.

Metal rail joiners are not always 100% reliable where electrical conductivity is concerned, and it may be worth considering soldering the rails into the joiners once the track has been installed and thoroughly tested. Remember to leave a few expansion joints to allow for fluctuations in temperature. Alternatively, install multiple power feeds to each track to ensure continuity of power across the rail joints.



Once the track layout is finalised, mark where each track section must be cut and jointed with a marker pen. Work on a single interface at a time, ensuring that each section marries up to its neighbour before continuing.



If cutting rails with shears, keep the open edge of the jaws to the waste side and the tool perpendicular to the rails for a clean, square cut. In most cases, the sleeper webbing can be cut at the same time.

# Fish around

Make sure that you choose the right fishplates to match your rails, taking note of the rail code and gauge.






If using a saw, a simple rail clamp prevents damage to the plastic sleepers and chairs during cutting. Using a small block of wood, make two parallel saw cuts to match the track gauge, allowing the block to slot onto the rails.




The outer edge of the block also acts as a guide for the saw, promoting a straight, vertical cut. With the rails gripped in the block's grooves, saw through the rails with a razor saw or junior hacksaw. Ensure that the blade is sharp.



Use a flat needle file to smooth the edge of the rail and remove any burrs. Check that the cut ends are truly vertical before following with fine abrasives to keep the rails smooth and free of rough edges.



While turnouts and track sections are designed to accommodate rail joiners, lengths of flexible track need to be modified. With a sharp blade. cut away the moulded rail chairs from the outer sleepers.



Trim the chair right back to the level of the sleeper and place a rail joiner on alternate rails, either side of the joint. Carefully bring both sections together and check that both rails meet snugly.




It's vital that the rail joiners slot cleanly between the rail and sleeper without disturbing the overall height of the railhead. Place a steel rule along the tops of the rails to make a final check before the track is secured.

# Smooth things over

Fine abrasive pads or wet-and-dry paper will polish the railheads after cutting and fettling, removing any tool marks that will attract dirt. Run a couple of items of rolling stock over the joint, testing for a smooth ride.





# FIX THE TRACK STEP STEP 1

Drill mounting holes for track pins, through the sleepers and into the substrate. Hold the pin with a set of long-nose pliers and tap the head lightly with a small hammer. The pliers will help to prevent the pins from bending.




Finish driving the pin home gradually to avoid distorting the sleepers. A nail punch helps if the hammer is too wide to fit between the rails. If the pin bends, extract it with pliers, discard safely and try again.

# Finescale 'OO' gauge rail

Peco's new bullhead rail track can be mated with regular Peco joiners, or a set of ultra-realistic fishplates, without the need to modify the sleepers. The fishplates are delicate and are best confined to straight sections or very shallow curves.





# WHAT ABOUT 'N' GAUGE?



'N' gauge track is trickier to join than 'OO', as the rails are partially embedded in the plastic sleepers. Cut the sleepers away completely to allow the joiners to be slid onto the rails of each section.



Once the sections are mated, a large gap will appear between the sleepers at the rail joint. However, pairs of sleepers can be cut to fit beneath the rails and joiners. Glue to secure to the track bed, once all of the track has been laid.

# Fixing it

Have you ever found yourself cursing as yet another track pin bends under the force of a hammer, or struggled to get a pin to pass through tough plastic sleepers? We're all faced with the chore of fixing track to a baseboard, but this simple job can sometimes lead to frustration and countless wasted pins.

However, by taking a little time to prepare the track, plus the use of a few simple tools, the task can be made all the more straightforward.

Sectional track often has small holes moulded in some of the sleepers for the pins to pass through, but flexible track and points often do not, so a pilot hole ought to be drilled first. Even with the sharpest pins, forcing them through the plastic sleepers will lead to distorted plastic or bent nails.

You can pin the track every 8-10 inches or so on straight sections, although curves will require more pins spaced closer together in order to maintain the desired geometry, especially when using flexible track.

If you intend to ballast your track eventually, there's no need to drive the pins all the way home, leaving them standing proud of the sleepers slightly. They can then be removed with pliers after ballasting, once the glue has cured fully.

Track pins differ in size. Thinner pins are more discreet but liable to distortion.

# Joining 'O' gauge track

Peco 'O' gauge track can be joined quickly, using standard metal joiners. The sleepers seldom require modification in the way that 'N' and 'OO' track does. A stronger set of cutting shears is needed, however, or a saw employed to cut the rails to length.


What? Needle files and abrasives

**Why?** Tidy up rail ends after cutting, ensuring that joiners can slide easily into place. Sanding pads remove any tool marks left by the files, especially on the rail heads.

Why? Mild abrasive blocks clean away any tarnish,
adhesive, paint and stray solder from the rails.

What? Mini power drill and bits
Why? As well as building the baseboards and myriad other jobs, a mini
drill is also vital for drilling pilot

diameters.

What? Track gauges and clamps
Why? Peco's simple plastic Tracksetta gauges
make it easy to set out consistent curves. Various

Alternatively, Proses' track clamps hold flexible rails in the desired curvature while you're fixing them to the baseboard with pins, providing that essential 'third hand'!



# LAY'N' GAUGE TRACK

**Peter Marriott** lays the track and makes the level crossing on his Wisbech & Upwell layout.

his Wisbech & Upwell layout was never going to be anything other than a glorified oval of track with trains passing a wayside depot, based on the one at Boyce's Bridge. I say 'based' because the real location had three loop tracks, but I decided to simplify mine and have two.

Making the track look realistic is one of the challenges of working in 'N'. I've previously used Atlas Code 65 True-Track, with its moulded plastic ballast, and Peco Code 80 Setrack. The Atlas track looked a lot more realistic to me because of the depth of both the rails and sleeper webbing when compared to that of Peco.

As I explained last issue, I've gone for Peco Code 55. The challenge is to not only get it looking good by hiding the excessive thickness of the webbing, but to ensure good connections between pieces of sectional track and refine the look of the pointwork.



Goods yard

The baseboard measures just 120cm by 80cm, and I had initially envisaged using only flexible track. After an evening of playing around with lengths of Peco Code 55, I decided that I'd make the rear third (hidden behind the backscene) using Peco Code 80 sectional curves. I did this so that the track would maintain its shape on sharp curves and would give me the chance to use more gradual curves on the visible part of the layout. Peco Code 55 and Code 80 track use the same fishplates and the track pieces are interchangeable, although there is a discrepancy in the depth of the rail and sleepers.

I covered the baseboard with Woodland Scenics Track Bed because of how well this suppresses the noise of trains. These sheets of black foam are very good for accepting fence posts, telegraph poles and other details.

For tight curves, Woodland Scenics recommends separating its Track Bed along the centre seam and repositioning the two pieces snugly together. On this layout, I cut small triangles from the material to form the inside of the curve. I used the strips in the fiddleyard and sheets on the scenic section.



Peco's Code 55 points have this extra sleeper attached to what can only be described as an extended sprue. Remove it with a sharp blade and retain the sleeper.



When joining tracks to the point's heel, you'll need to remove sleepers from one of the adjoining tracks, otherwise the sleepers will clash.



Mark how many sleepers you need to remove to clear the adjoining track. Cut through the webbing with a sharp blade. If you've cut the track to length, tidy the ends with a file.



Gently push the rail joiners onto the ends of the point. Then, resting on the baseboard or table, push the approach track rails into the joiners to complete the connection.



Using a piece of Woodland Scenics Track Bed and Peco Setrack, I drew the track's position onto the baseboard.



I cut small triangles of foam from the Track Bed so that it would follow the curve of the track. It took a bit of trial and error with the cutting to achieve an accurate curve.



Take the track and foam away and apply adhesive with a paintbrush. Woodland Scenics Foam Tack glue is recommended, but neat PVA - which is what I used - is just as good.



I held the Track Bed down on top of the baseboard with Woodland Scenics Foam Nails while the glue dried. The track isn't fixed at this point.



Here is the completed fiddleyard section, just awaiting the track. I covered the scenic area in the foreground with Track Bed sheets (they measure 30.4cm by 60.9cm).



Run a bead of glue over the foam and position the track. When you're happy that it's in the correct position, hold it down with Foam Nails and wait for the glue to cure.



Now test the layout. When you're happy, you can start on the fun stuff - detailing the track. The first stage is to protect the contact between point blade and stock rail.



Give the track a good covering of Humbrol 29 Dark Brown acrylic aerosol. This will tone down the plastic sleepers while ensuring the rail sides have a good rusty colour.



The rear of the tops of the rails have been cleaned with an abrasive block. The rail heads in the lower right of the picture are still covered in paint.



I used very fine sand for the ballast. Deposit a heap with a small spoon and tamp it down with the spoon's back, your finger and a stiff paintbrush.



Mix water and a drop of washing-up liquid in a Deluxe Materials Ballast Spray Bottle. Mist the mixture over the ballast and then dribble on some Woodland Scenics Cement with a pipette.

# Building up the land

It's easy to fall into the trap of inadvertently creating a ballast shoulder when you just put an underlay under the track. You can see the ballast shoulder on a modern main line, where the deep stone ballast lifts the track above the surroundings to create a very obvious definition between 'the railway' and 'not the railway'.

This isn't an acceptable look for all railways, especially the Wisbech & Upwell. Being a roadside tramway, there was quite literally - no boundary between the railway and its surroundings.

Covering your baseboard with foam or cork sheet will enable you remove the ballast shoulder effect that laying underlay purely underneath your track will create. However, to create the full W&U effect, I needed to bring the surrounding landscape - especially the roads - to almost the same level as the rail tops. 2mm mount board, available from any art or hobby store, is perfect. I cut some sheets of card to cover the entire landscape on either side of the railway.

At many W&U depots, particularly Boyce's Bridge Depot, access to the goods yard was via a level crossing. My depot certainly needed one, but I didn't think that the grain of real wood (balsawood) would be visible in this scale so I made mine using some Woodland Scenics Assorted Modelling Sheets. Here's how I got on...



To ensure that there was no sharp edge or step next to the road, I used Deluxe Materials Perfect Plastic Putty to fill the gap. Once dry, smooth it with abrasive paper.



The last job was to paint the road grey, to provide a neat contrast to the wooden level crossing. All that was needed to finish the track was some weeds...

# MAKE A LEVEL CROSSING



To build up the level of the land around the track, I used 2mm mounting card. There's an obvious white edge to the card, so paint it - and cover the rest with acrylics.



I cut the Assorted Modelling Sheets with a Swann-Morton knife and then smoothed the surface with a piece of Tamiya finishing paper to prevent a step next to the road.



I used a dark brown acrylic paint, purchased from Hobbycraft, to paint the white pieces of foam.



The beauty of using a card base is that you can sketch the position of key scenic features onto it with a pen or pencil. Here's the location for the level crossing.



Here are the five pieces of cut foam sheet roughly *in situ*. I tested both running lines with wagons to ensure that I had left sufficient gap for the wheels to pass.



It took two coats of brown acrylic paint to fully cover the white foam pieces. I cleaned any excess paint off the rails after it had dried, using a track rubber.

# CONNECT TRACKS OVER GAPS

Rails at the baseboard ends are prone to damage, especially on portable layouts, as **George Dent** recently discovered.

ike most modellers, I lack the space for a permanent layout at home.
Therefore, portable baseboards have been a necessity over the years. With this arrangement, however, comes the need for creating reliable rail joints between boards.

The need for close-fitting rails is important, so that our trains can move safely from one section to another. The other vital factor is resilience. The rails at each end of the baseboard are inevitably exposed to potential



damage, with plastic-sleepered, proprietary track being the most delicate, especially finer scale versions.

Accordingly, I usually replace the end sleepers at each baseboard joint with copper-clad board, with the rails soldered securely. This seems to have been sufficient in the past, although I've usually been assiduous

in building secure wooden crates for storing the baseboards. Recently, however, one of my mini layouts suffered some terrible damage to the tracks. Alas, I was entirely to blame.

Not only was my clumsiness the cause of the broken rails and sleepers, but lack of forethought put them at greater risk in the first place. Having begun life simply as a working diorama, I decided to convert 'Lisburn Lane' into a fully functioning micro layout, with fiddleyards at either end of the 4ft scenic section.



Rails passing across baseboard joints are prone to damage, so they need to be reinforced effectively.

Consigning the building of the fiddleyards for a rainy day, I left the rails overhanging the baseboard ends slightly, knowing that the layout's flimsy MDF shell would soon be encased with a sturdier plywood box, complete with lighting rig. Unfortunately, the strengthening work only occurred after the track at both ends was mangled.

# TRICKY REPAIR

The single copper-clad sleeper, soldered to the rails at each end of the baseboard, wasn't enough to protect the Peco Code 75 track from extensive damage, stretching a good six inches inboard. The only option was to cut out the affected rails and dig out the sleepers from the ballasted track bed. With the damaged track sections partly obscured by a bridge and trees, access for repairs proved a little tricky.

But, after taking a deep breath, I set to work and managed to get the track re-laid after a couple of days. Having learned my lesson the hard way, I've adopted a more rigorous approach to securing the tracks the second time around!

# REPLACE DAMAGED TRACK



Identify the extent of the damage to the track and cut the rails in situ with a set of sharp Xuron cutters. Keep the flat edge of the blades to the 'good' side, minimising the need for dressing the ends with files.



Remove the scrap rail sections and carefully scrape away the ballast and sleepers with a broad, flat chisel. Work slowly and look out for track pins, which can be plucked out with fine pliers.



Vacuum away the loose debris and gently cut away the plastic chairs from the rail ends. This can be tricky in awkward areas, although a small, fresh scalpel blade (such as a Swann-Morton No. 15A) makes the job easier.



Cut a new section of track to the required length (slightly longer if bridging a baseboard joint). Use this new section to transfer the rail joiners gently onto the old rails with fine pliers.

# Not-so-sticky situation

Extracting the damaged sections of track wasn't as difficult as I'd expected, owing mostly to the adhesive used to fix the ballast. Instead of the traditional diluted PVA glue, which sets rock-hard, I'd used this layout to test Ballast Bond, a liquid glue from Deluxe Materials.

With no need for diluting, Ballast Bond penetrates the stone chippings and forms a secure bond with a clear, matt finish. It remains flexible when dry and can be peeled away easily at any time in the future, without damaging track or points. Any stubborn residues can be removed with warm water.



In fact, when lifting the sleepers, the only source of resistance came from the track pins, which needed extracting with fine pliers.



# **GROUND WORKS**





Don't forget to reinstate any track power feeds where necessary. As this section will be hidden by an overbridge, I simply soldered the wires to the ends of the copper-clad sleeper.



# BRIDGE BASEBOARD JOINTS



A handful of copper-clad sleepers replace the original sleepers on each side of the baseboard joint. Add plastic card shims to maintain the correct rail height. Fix the sleepers to the plastic card with cyano or epoxy glue.



Insulating slots must be filed into the face of each sleeper to prevent short circuits. Double check with a multi-meter to ensure the conductive coating has been broken completely.



In this case, the adjacent track and new sleeper section have been fixed to the baseboard with PVA and left to cure overnight. The rail is then soldered to the copper-clad sleepers, one at a time.




Use gauges to maintain alignment while soldering the second rail in position. Use a hot, powerful iron, non-acid flux and avoid getting large lumps of solder on the inside of the rails.



Clean the solder joints with damp swabs to remove any traces of flux, followed by a few strokes with a wire brush. Run a track rubber over the rail heads, followed by a polish with a fine abrasive pad.



Brush or vacuum away any debris and check the track section with items of rolling stock. Look out for wheel flanges catching any lumps of solder, running a file over any offending deposits.



For obstructed areas of the scenic layout, construct replacement sections on the workbench. Where tracks cross baseboards at an angle, ensure that the rails are supported as close to the ends as possible.



Test-fit the new track sections and check for consistent rail height with a straightedge, creating extra plastic shims if necessary. Also check clearance for platform edges and other lineside structures.



Re-drill holes for track pins before laying the track onto a bed of PVA glue. Press the pins into the underlay with pliers, or a hammer if room allows. Make final checks for alignment and leave to cure overnight.



Carefully trim the rail ends flush with the baseboard edges with a set of Xuron cutters. Dress with a broad, flat smoothing file, followed by abrasive pads to remove any tool marks.



Repeat the dressing of the rail ends on the adjacent baseboard and make any necessary adjustments to the alignment and height of the board joints. Aim for a small gap between the rails of about 0.5-1mm.



Make up any power connections and test the layout fully with a variety of rolling stock, before ballasting, painting and weathering the new track sections to blend with the rest of the layout.

# BALLAST A TRACK - WITHOUT TEARS!

Where track ballasting is concerned, achievement never matches aspiration for **Chris Leigh**, but why did railways need ballast, and why were the tracks so scrupulously neat?

used to think ballasting was like Marmite, but it isn't. Some people actually like Marmite, but no one that I've ever met likes ballasting track, in any scale! When I built my 'O' gauge 'The Railway Children' layout, I got my seven-year-old granddaughter, Megan, to do the ballasting work and I just applied the glue. I did the ballasting myself on 'Polwyddelan', but there wasn't much of it and, as it is a modern branch line, it didn't need to be particularly neat.

Now, for my next exercise I've moved to 'N' gauge. I did build a little 'Hayling Island' layout in 'N' gauge a few years ago. I don't remember

much about the ballasting, but the main length of track was on the wooden Langstone Viaduct and that wasn't ballasted. The new project represents the Staines West branch, from the terminus through to Poyle Halt. It used to be a wonderfully rural branch, despite its proximity to Heathrow Airport and the London suburbs.

From Staines West station it passed allotments before heading through a willow copse, up over the Wyrardisbury River and the Southern line to Windsor and out onto Staines Moor. After a couple of miles it reached Poyle Halt (for Stanwell Moor) and

entered an area of light industries at the lineside.

I went through my collection of Staines branch photographs and singled out those that cover the section which my layout will depict. Inevitably, a large number of the photographs were taken in the few weeks before the passenger service was withdrawn at the end of March 1965. This was a railway which had been in decline since the end of the Second World War and had been awaiting Beeching's axe for over a year. Yet the track in the photographs is immaculate. Today's main lines are overgrown and neglected by

# What does ballast do?

Ballast is the one constant feature of railway track. Brunel's baulk road gave way to cross-sleepers. Timber sleepers gave way to concrete. Bridge and Barlow rails gave way to bullhead and that, in turn, was replaced by flatbottom rail. Fishplates were replaced by continuous welded rail. Only now is slab track replacing ballast, and then only on new builds in tunnels or on high-speed lines.

Ballast, which is crushed rock, provides a consistent, easily levelled bed on which the track is laid. Further ballast is then added and tamped into place between and around the sleepers. It holds the track in place, supports it evenly and provides drainage.

Today's use of deep ballasting requires less maintenance, and the absence of frequent inspections by men on foot does mean that some of the detailed attention - to weed removal, for instance - is no longer done. While the track is better than ever, in line with higher train speeds, the periphery is less well maintained, with weeds and undergrowth frequently encroaching into the lineside cess, sidings and even station areas.

comparison, yet this was by no means uncommon on branch lines maintained in the old ways to old-fashioned standards. No wonder Beeching looked so closely at costs.

This was in the days when a 'ganger' patrolled his length on a daily basis, and when there was a prize for the best-kept length; track and cesses were scrupulously maintained. On a branch where there were no heavy freight trains constantly braking, where trains had no toilets discharging onto the track, and where the service was never intensive, there was little to discolour the ballast. An annual visit by the weed-killing

train, with its powerful spraying equipment, was sufficient to keep the cesses clear of vegetation: I well recall the browned and dead leaves of the lineside growth which indicated a recent visit.

If we are modelling a historic time - and my memories of the Staines branch date from 50 years ago - we must model the scene as it looked then, not how we imagine it looked based on our modern viewpoint. The picture at the top of this page shows just how good the track looked and it was that quality of track and ballast maintenance that I wanted my 'N' gauge effort to reflect.

# Traditional methods

The traditional method of track maintenance was labour-intensive and involved the 'ganger', or platelayer, walking his allocated length of line and visually inspecting it at close quarters. He would carry his key hammer and drive back into place any wooden keys that had worked loose. He, and the men who worked with him (if any), would attend to such routine tasks like keeping the cess clear of weeds and clearing debris from watercourses or culverts which might otherwise block and flood the line or cause a landslip.

The result of this close attention to detail was a railway so well maintained that there would be annual contests for the best-kept section. Some would even be marked with 'Prize Length' displayed on a board at the lineside. I seem to recall seeing one on the Taunton-Barnstaple line in the mid-1960s. With all this attention, the ballast would not be forgotten and it was often a case of 'not a stone out of place'.

# How to ballast track

Ballasting is a necessary chore, but it needn't be too onerous. **George Dent** offers some helpful and simple hints for success.

# ANY GAUGE

Ballasting can be achieved surprisingly quickly, with simple methods and very little equipment. We can even 'age' our ballast effectively using a special dye mixed with the adhesive, making it easier to recreate a weathered appearance or fine-tune the shade of stone.

Furthermore, mixing together slightly different shades and grades of ballast before applying the track can also introduce some welcome natural variation. For this demonstration, I combined two slightly different shades of Geoscenics' grey ballast before applying to the track. A much finer, lighter shade was then spread in the 'cess', for that manicured steam era look.



# George says...

For this 'O' gauge track, I've used ballast grades billed for 'OO' and 'N' gauges.
Erring on the smaller size, whatever scale you may be working in, often creates superior results

- Teaspoon
- Syringe applicator

Tools needed

- Mixing bowls
- PVA adhesive
- Washing-up liquid
- Plant mister
- Paintbrushes

With the track pinned down and all electrical connections made, the ballast can be positioned with a teaspoon. Be sure that the chippings are evenly distributed between the sleepers.



Mix PVA adhesive, warm water and a few drops of washing-up liquid in a jar, stirring thoroughly to create a water-like viscosity. A few drops of Geoscenics ballast dye can also be added as desired.



A dry paintbrush helps spread the ballast and attain a uniform depth, just below the top of the sleepers. Also use the brush to move ballast clear of point blades, tie-bars, crossing vees and any power contacts.



Dispense the glue mix with a syringe and pin-point needle tip. The pre-wetted ballast will readily absorb the glue. Work on a few square inches at a time, re-wetting the ballast with the mister or airbrush as you go.




Carefully arrange a finer grade of ballast in the cess, on either side of the line. Using a plant mister or airbrush, gently wet the ballast with water or a mild alcohol (IPA) to reduce the surface tension on the porous surface.




Work gently to avoid disturbing the ballast, although the back of the teaspoon will flatten any craters left by air bubbles. Once the ballast is flooded with the diluted white glue, leave the surface to dry for a few days.

There's a lot more to tracks than just rails and sleepers. **Richard Foster** presents a selection of different ones and how you can model them.



# **RAIL TRANSITION**

Britain's railways have traditionally used bullhead rail, held in chairs that were bolted to wooden sleepers. Keeping this track in good order was a time-consuming process so, during the BR era, flatbottom rail started to become the norm. This view of 'WD' No. 90487 at Colwick, near Nottingham, on July 31 1965 (above) shows the

transition taking place: the line in the foreground is of bullhead rail and the far track is flatbottom.

# 'STEAM ERA' COLOUR

This is Aylestone, just south of Leicester, on the Great Central Railway's London Extension, as '9F' No. 92092 pounds south with a lengthy goods train. The track is in typical 'steam era' condition; the ballast is neat, the embankments are tidy and the whole track is what can only be described as 'lightly weathered'. The use of pale sieved sand will recreate the beige-grey ballast colour, while a light coat of weathering aerosol will add just the right amount of dirt to the sleepers.

#### **HOW TO GET THE LOOK:**

Give your track a light coat of RailMatch 1403 Roof Dirt or 1406 Sleeper Grime aerosol spray paint (www.fox-transfers.co.uk) or some Precision Paints P961 Sleeper Grime via an airbrush (www.phoenix-paints.co.uk).

#### **RUST NEVER SLEEPS**

There's some major trackwork going on at Cambridge on March 8 1982, as 'Peak' 45043 passes with an Up freight. The freshly laid ballast is a beautifully uniform shade of grey and complements the pristine concrete sleepers. But notice how the new rails already sport a layer of surface rust. The tops will eventually become shiny due to passing trains, but the sides will retain their rusty shade.

HOW TO GET THE LOOK: You can paint the rail sides (and chairs where applicable) with a rust-colour paint, using a fine brush or Joe's Model Trains Rusty Rails Painter (www.osbornsmodels. com). Or just give the track a coat of Humbrol 29 Dark Earth Matt acrylic aerosol and clean the rail

#### SHOULDER AND DETAILS

The modern main line presents a very different picture to that of the steam era. Plain track usually has concrete sleepers, but the thing that catches the eye the most is the deep ballast with its obvious ballast shoulder. The other factor to bear in mind is the 'accessories'; the cable troughs, AWS ramps, TPWS grids and lineside relay boxes and cabinets, to name but four. Thankfully, all are easy to model.

**HOW TO GET THE LOOK:** Mix Deluxe Materials'

Ballast Magic (www.gaugemaster.com) with a grey ballast of your choice and follow the instructions to sculpt a suitable ballast shoulder. Use the moulded ramps, grids, cabinets and concrete troughs from Wills/Peco, which are available from Peco stockists (www.peco-uk.com).





#### **GREASE IS THE WORD**

This July 1984 photograph of Garsdale on the Settle & Carlisle is full of useful track details. The track may be flatbottom rail, but it's still jointed every 60ft. Fishplates need greasing to allow the track to expand and contract, and you can see the black of the grease contrasting with the brown of the rust. Mechanical parts of the points have been greased too. Also in this photograph is the point rodding, a feature largely gone from the railway and often overlooked on layouts.

**HOW TO GET THE LOOK:** A dab of black paint on your rail joiners will make a visual difference. Wills' plastic point rodding is inexpensive and readily available (from Peco stockists) so there's no excuse not to have this important feature on your layout.







#### **SLIPPING STANDARDS**

The immaculate condition of the railway began to slide during the 1970s. This 1977 view of 'Deltic' 9014 The Duke of Wellington's Regiment accelerating up Holloway with a King's Cross to Newcastle service reveals that most of the permanent way is still in excellent condition. However, ballast is beginning to cover the sleepers, surplus rails are left in the six foot and wild plants are thriving.

HOW TO GET THE LOOK: Model buddleia by covering pieces of seamoss with





things you might like to try

Track renewal could take place anywhere, no matter the quality of the original permanent way. This is Bickershaw Colliery, in Lancashire, and despite the quality of the permanent way, a point has been replaced. The coal dust 'ballast' is left to one side and fresh sleepers are still exposed. Granite ballast has been used to pack some of the track.



Loading terminals take on the colour of the material being loaded. The most distinctive was the white that covered cement and china clay sidings. Track, buildings and even rolling stock took on a ghostly appearance. Neil Sullivan's approach to modelling a china clay dries was to use real, dry china clay (correctly called kaolin), sieving it over the layout and fixing it in place with PVA.



Tracks embedded in roads are the only thing more intriguing than a weed-covered railway. Modelling this used to be time-consuming, but now we have two more options: laser-cut ply from Scale Model Scenery (www. scalemodelscenery.co.uk) or 3D-printed inserts from Rue d'Étropal (www. rue-d-etropal.com) that are designed to fit around 'OO' gauge section track systems.



#### TRACK VS NATURE

The most intriguing type of railway is one where the tracks are so covered with weeds that it's hard to see how a train can pass. The Talyllyn Railway's overgrown track is what piqued Tom Rolt's interest enough to lay the foundations for the railway preservation movement. Happily, the track in this 2000 photograph is in better shape, but it still conveys the mystery and romance of the 'organic' railway.

**HOW TO GET THE** LOOK: Dollop PVA onto ballasted and painted track, then apply 6mm static grass fibres (2mm for

'N' gauge).

# ASSEMBLE A PACER FLEET

**Paul A. Lunn** suggests ways of creating the ultimate fleet of BR railbuses.



y admiration for the 'Pacers' arises from their rugged, functional appearance, the clever ingenuity of two disparate forms of transport brought together in one practical design and their usefulness, in model form, by providing us with a minimum-space Diesel Multiple Unit.

'OO' gauge modellers have a great start in assembling a 'Pacer' collection with Realtrack Models' superb Class 143s and 144s. It also has a Class 142 on the drawing board to replace the old Hornby model.

Hornby's '142' isn't bad when you consider that it's 30 years old this year and can be upgraded to a more acceptable standard (Hurst Models' CKUOOO Class 142 Pacer/Skipper 'single leaf' double doors are a particularly useful product). Furthermore, the Hornby model is a potential donor for the early Leyland experimental railbuses.

It makes common sense for advanced

modellers to replicate British Rail and British Leyland's method by combining train and bus products together; so that's Hornby's chassis and EFE's 1:76 scale Leyland National. Alternatively, for less experienced modellers, there's a couple of sneaky cheats, and a flexible interpretation using the Hornby model in its entirety, for various end results.

Variations
Class 141 141103 and Class 142 142087 at
Selby on March 30 1994. Despite only a year
or two between the builds and a similar
amount of Leyland parts used in both, the
two units reveal a number of key variations:
roof construction and shape; driving cab
window and, perhaps most importantly, the
'141' is only bus width, hence the gap
between it and the platform edge.



#### Prototype and model comparative analysis

The Class 141 and its predecessors were built using the standard-width Leyland National bus body, and there are two principal lengths - 11.3m and 10.3m - with EFE's die-cast model seeming most appropriate for the job. The shorter body is the most useful, in that panel and window length is

the same as those used on BR stock.
The latter is unsuitable and a donor model can only offer its cab, roof, roof pod and doors for LEV 1.

Table 2 shows the relevant dimensions on the 11.3m body, and in compiling this I was surprised just how many principal measurements were similar or the same, save for LEV 1, suggesting that adaptation is likely to be less onerous than you might initially think. Even though I've not been able to confirm every measurement, it wouldn't be difficult to make a good guess given others on the table.

#### How to build a LEV 1

**LEV 1:** There are two options to make LEV 1. You could either cut and shut two EFE Leyland National Mk 1 bus bodies (cut as shown) or fit the National cabs to Hornby's Class 142 body. Both require a Hornby chassis to complete. This will need to be reduced in length and the wheel centres adjusted. Add front end and side detail, nose cone and skirts, UK or US outlines. The finished model has been made by modeller Garry Long. BOTH: GARRY LONG

**LEV 2:** There are two options here, using EFE National 2 bodies (two long-length required) on Hornby Class 142 chassis or EFE cabs and Hornby Class 142 body and chassis. The chassis will need lengthening.





THAILAND DEMONSTRATOR: Hornby Class 142 body and chassis (single unit) plus spare cab L6361 or cut from another unit. Note that the model is too wide, and those looking for greater accuracy should reduce body width. RBOOZ: Hornby Class 142 body and chassis (single unit) plus spare cab L6361 or cut from another unit.

**RB003:** EFE National 2 bus body and cabs (two long length required) and Hornby Class 142 chassis. See photo above.

**RB004:** Hornby Class 142 body and chassis (single unit) plus spare cab L6361, or cut from another unit.

**Class 140:** Hornby Class 142 two-car unit body and chassis. Model will be too wide. Cabs scratchbuilt using scale drawings from www. pdhdrawings.com You'll see from drawings

and photographs that there's a wide panel at the mid-point which needs splicing in. **Class 141:** Hornby Class 142 two-car body and chassis.

#### **Bodies and chassis**

LEV 1-Class 141 shared the narrower bus body, so there are three options to consider if you're planning an EFE/Hornby conversion:

1 Ignore the difference.

2 Reduce the width of both the Class 142 body and chassis to produce an earlier unit.


3 Use EFE bus bodies on reduced-width Hornby chassis.

You can see that the lower part of the body forms part of the chassis moulding. These will need to be removed to enable the bus body to sit on the chassis properly. Below this, the Hornby chassis is as wide as that of the bus.

Save for LEV 1 and the Class 140, chassis shape has remained pretty much the same on all the Leyland experimental vehicles. Prospective modellers are advised to obtain relevant photographs of any chassis, or use the drawings from www.pdhdrawings.com

Note that Hornby's chassis scales to 14.48m and will need its length adjusting. You'll also need to fill or cover the wheel arches on the bus body and fill in the body side between the bus body's lower edge and the top edge of the chassis.





#### Want a Class 144 Motor Second?

The ten Class 144 Motor Seconds were the only non-driving vehicles built for the 'Pacer'. There's no off-the-shelf model, but Realtrack Models' Charlie Petty does have a limited number of damaged Class 144 body shells and chassis that are ideal for conversion. If you want one, be quick and call 01132 563415.

#### Easy cheats

There's quite a lot of work involved in cutting bus bodies and Hornby chassis that may seem daunting to some. Here are a few concepts that don't involve any 'cutting and shutting' but still give you the joy of having a LEV 1 on your layout.

You'll need to re-paint your EFE model, so I've mocked up some ideas - but the finished model will require a bit more work to get the best from the scene.





# PUT A LAYOUT IN YOUR LOFT

Ever wondered about the potential for building a railway in the attic? As **George Dent** explains, there's a lot to consider before taking the plunge.

ofts offer a tantalising prospect to space-starved modellers. The lure of running longer trains, free from the constraints of a small spare bedroom or a damp shed, is hard to ignore. The joys of a permanently set-up layout, always ready for use, is a real attraction, especially for those with limited spare time. Let's face it, uncrating and assembling separate baseboards is a real chore!

A properly converted attic, with the

comforts of warmth, light and plenty of headroom makes for a pleasant modelling environment, removed from the hustle and bustle of the rest of the house. Indeed, a good-quality loft conversion can add real value to your home.

The environment must be a safe and pleasant one, free of excessive temperature fluctuations, dust and debris. Don't forget that the point of a railway room is to provide a comfortable space in which to enjoy your

hobby. If the attic is difficult to access, cramped, stiflingly hot or freezing cold, then there won't be much incentive to spend much time up there.

Therefore, a number of vital questions must be asked before deciding whether your own attic is suitable for conversion into a railway room. Budget is the all-important factor, with structural and access issues equally crucial.

There's also the thorny issue of planning

Rafters, purlins, or any other internal supports, must not be altered without expert advice. They're designed to withstand the weight of roof tiles or slates, which increases significantly during high winds, heavy rain and snow. Any modifications will have to take these forces into account and,



#### Hot & cold

Without some means of negating fluctuations in temperature and humidity, an attic isn't an ideal site for a model railway. Metal rails will expand in warm conditions, so expansion joints must be incorporated at regular intervals to guard against buckling.

Card buildings and other porous

materials, like MDF, are also sensitive to changes in humidity, putting them at risk of distortion. Additionally, model locomotives and rolling stock - with sensitive electronic components - deserve to be kept in a more stable environment. When hot, oils and lubricants lose their viscosity and will seep out of motors and gears.

While no rails were laid, baseboards were built around the perimeter, with plenty of storage underneath and even a small workbench area. All of the important building work had been done: the floor joists reinforced, plenty of insulation installed and the walls panelled. A small Velux window was also in place, allowing a degree of temperature control in summer (although it still got very warm). The key was remembering to close the window at night or if rain was likely!

Access was via a rickety, drop-down ladder and was not for the faint-hearted. A simple drop-down cover sealed the aperture and prevented any nasty accidents. The hatchway was very narrow, however and made it difficult to hoist layout building materials and equipment into the room.

Being over 6ft tall, I found the lack of headroom in all but the very centre of the attic a little challenging. That aside, it turned out to be a great space to retreat into after a hard day at work. There's something wonderful about watching long trains pootling around while building kits and tinkering with scenery.

Even though it was above a small two-bedroom cottage, the attic provided plenty of room. Indeed, despite moving to a larger house, I haven't had space for running scale-length trains since.

permission to consider (see page 84); failure to abide by local planning laws can have nasty and expensive consequences.

Alterations to your home must also be done with great care and current building regulations need to be consulted. Therefore, *Model Rail* recommends you get expert advice before starting any work on an attic.

The attics of most houses are designed solely for holding the roof up, while also providing space for water tanks and other essential domestic services. The floor joists are often smaller and less sturdy than those fitted at ground floor or bedroom levels. Their main purpose is to support the ceilings of the rooms below and are rarely capable of bearing even moderate loads. This is especially so in houses built in the UK since the 1960s. The joists can be strengthened or replaced, and fitting interlocking flooring will help to distribute the loadings.

Modern UK housing tends to employ prefabricated rafters - the timber webs that support the pitched roof - and these afford little usable space within the loft. In contrast, older or more traditional properties feature longitudinal bearers (purlins) that support a much simpler rafter arrangement, resulting in more space beneath the roof.

### Workbench

as well as structural alterations, there may also be a need to relocate water tanks, pipework and electric cables, adding to the overall cost.

The amount of usable space - in terms of headroom and floor area - will vary, depending on the height and pitch of the roof. Unless you have the space and budget to accommodate a permanent staircase into the attic, a fold-down ladder will have to suffice. However, you need to be fairly mobile in order to climb and descend a ladder.

Furthermore, the size of the access hatch will need to be big enough to accommodate yourself and the transit of materials and stock for the layout. Once you're up there, can you move about freely? Constantly stooping, bending and kneeling isn't much fun, especially for those with dodgy backs and creaking joints.

Extra headroom can be created by installing dormer roof sections, but this will demand a significant investment and the need to seek planning permission.

The roof of a house is classed as a thermal element and, in order to comply with current building regulations, the attic space must be insulated to a level that meets energy efficiency specifications.

Insulation between the rafters and underfoot will also create a more comfortable environment, combating freezing temperatures in winter and reducing heat penetration in summer. Rising heat from the rooms below will also be prevented.

Don't forget to factor in some form of heating arrangements for those colder days, such as a thermostat-controlled electric heater, or even running an extra radiator from the central heating system.

Ventilation remains vital, as the timber and masonry still needs to 'breathe'. It's tempting to seal up every source of draughts, but if the air inside the attic becomes stagnant, it can lead to problems of condensation, damp and rot; affecting the layout and the fabric of the building.

Layout building, operation and modelling in general demands plenty of light, be it

### Do I need planning permission?

Planning laws differ across the UK and are regularly updated, and it's your responsibility to check if permission is needed before any work begins. Contact the planning department of your local council to find out about the planning regulations in force in your area.

artificial, natural or a combination of both. Skylights and Velux-style windows offer a practical and economical option, as the structure of the roof needs little modification - in contrast to adding a dormer or traditional window in a wall.

Check with your local authority about the need for planning permission before installing skylights or extra windows. Furthermore, they need to be fitted by an expert to maintain the integrity of the roof trusses and ensure a weatherproof seal.

Opening skylights also allow ingress of fresh air and the chance to regulate the internal temperature of the attic to more comfortable levels. They will let plenty of rain in too, if left open at the wrong time!

Electric lighting will also be required, for those shorter winter days and hobby evenings. Design the lighting set-up in tandem with your layout and workspace plans to ensure that key areas will be illuminated sufficiently.












#### Hull Paragon

# LAYOUT BUILDING: FACT VS FICTION

l've been playing trains for a number of years, but with 2018 fast approaching, I've decided to make it the year that I build my first proper layout. The problem is, I can't decide whether to embark on a prototye or freelance layout. On the one hand, I've a varied collection of 'OO' stock to play with, but then again, I'm not sure if my imagination is up the task of creating a realistic fictional setting...

Gary Lloyd, Birmingham

**Mike says:** This is one of those questions where everyone will have an opinion, but there will never be a definitive answer. The layout you build should be ruled by your own circumstances and interests alone.

That said, I can outline the processes involved in building both layout formats, to help you make a more informed decision. I can even provide you with a third option, but more on that later.

**Prototype layouts:** I've often heard that prototype layouts don't require as much planning as freelance layouts. And, while this might be true to an extent, most modellers need to plan for space restrictions.

Stephen Fay's 'Severn Tunnel East' is a good example of compression in action. Built to scale, his 'O' gauge layout would need to be around 30ft in length. Compressed, it's only 8ft, but the prototype is still instantly recognisable as Severn Tunnel East.

Prototype layouts are particularly suited to those who have a keen interest in the history of their chosen subject matter. Some layouts, like Geoff Williams' 'Aylesbury LNWR' (MR233), are even used to educate the general public at exhibition as it is that accurate!

If you're not a fan of scratchbuilding though, you may find your options are slightly limited. Most prototype layouts require at least some scratchbuilt structures, some prototype ranges do have specific prototypes almost entirely covered - Bachmann Scenecraft's Shillingstone inspired proprietary resin buildings are one such example.

Another consideration - especially if you mean to exhibit your layout - is that viewers are likely to be more critical of a prototype layout. A good model should be instantly recognisable as the protoype, whether or not that's an attractive challenge is down to you.

Freelance layouts: You might think that a freelance layout builder can do whatever they want but, if you're intent on representing reality, you'll need to make sure that your fictional world is believable.

It's surprising just how much research a freelance layout can require - especially if you want the railway itself to behave realistically, too. You need to make sure that the location feels believable, so drawing inspiration from real source material is a must.

Unlike prototype layouts, freelance builds are very often built using proprietary and kit structures only. In fact, one of the most common reasons why modellers build freelance layouts is so they can model whatever they want. If you can find reason to install a Ferris wheel in the centre of a GWR branch line, run with it!





Similarly, freelance layouts are popular among modellers with a varied collection of stock. Some layouts are carefully built so as not to represent a specific region or era.

Protolance layouts: Okay, so protolance is not a real word (you heard it here first), but it does adequtely describe a final layout category, which is a mix of prototype and freelance. Such layouts are predominently freelance, but are heavily inspired by the style or specific sections of a real prototype.

A wonderful example of this is Peter Bossom's 'Sub Wealden Gypsum Co.' (MR239), which takes its setting from a prototype but - due to sparse source imagery - is very much freelance as far as the trackplan and buildings.

The advantage of this process is that it's easier to keep your imagination in check; your layout has a clear purpose, and you can borrow the ideas that you like and after the ones that you don't.

Each layout type has pros and cons-your choice will depend on your own personal requirements. My only word of advice? Don't let challenge get in the way of building your dream layout.





#### On location



In the not too distant past, building a prototype meant sifting through books and heading out to visit *real* locations. Today, the Internet has blessed us with far more resources; between interactive online maps and endless picture libraries, research is often a doddle. But, such information is so readily available that it can be hard to justify a field trip - especially if it's at the other end of the country. And yet, Model Rail always recommends visiting the prototype you're building, even if it doesn't exist anymore. Just getting a feel for an area can be hugely inspirational.
Don't forget to take lots of photographs!

MODELLING JARGON BUSTER

Freelance layout: Not based on a real location, built entirely from one's imagination.

**Prototypelayout:** Built to resemble a real prototype location.

**Protolance layout:** Freelance layout that's heavily inspired by one or more prototype locations.

#### Technique of the month

#### Adding realistic wagon loads.

I've been using Geoscenics' wagon fill kits for my 4mm and 7mm scale mineral wagons, with great success. Thick, corrugated board is provided, which is cut and glued to form false floors for the wagon interiors. Realistic coal chippings are also supplied, while other commodities, such as ballast and stone are also available.

By building up several layers of card into a rough mound shape, the quantity of coal chippings - and thus the overall weight - is reduced. Instead of using the traditional diluted PVA glue to bond the coal, try Deluxe Materials' Ballast Bond, which is applied neat via a pin-point tip. It dries quickly and is easy to remove in future. (GD)


Measure the wagon's interior and cut a rectangle of card to slot inside. Add legs and a mound of several chamfered layers. Bond with PVA adhesive.



Allow the card former to dry overnight before slotting into the wagon. Pour in the coal chippings with a teaspoon, shaping it into a suitable mound.



Secure with Deluxe Ballast Bond. The thin glue penetrates readily, so don't overdo it! Check that no glue is seeping through any gaps and leave to cure.



#### **EDIT PHOTOS THE OLD WAY**



I enjoy photographing my layouts, and have noticed that none of Chris Nevard's shots ever show the edges of a

baseboard. I'm guessing he manipulates his photographs digitally, but that's not something I'd ever be able to do. Is there a less technical solution?

**Peter says:** Capturing the edge of a baseboard when photographing a layout is sometimes unavoidable, but I've come up with a practical solution - a photographic extension piece.

The one I'm demonstrating here depicts a simple retaining wall and embankment, but yours could resemble anything that fits alongside your layout.

Held to the front of the layout with spring clamps, the extension piece can be moved as per the photograph being taken. It's also easy to attach and detach, held in place with spring clamps. That said, I wouldn't trust the clamps with too much weight, so it's



imperative that your creation isn't too heavy.

I used 2mm mount board to create the former (foam board would work well, too) and embossed plastic card for the wall - capped with a 1mm strip of card. With the retaining wall painted, I used a Gaugemaster Meadow Mat to cover the embankment, along with several scatters for tonal variety.

The extension cost less than £3 to make and has transformed my photographs of the layout - all without a computer in sight!

#### **QUICK FIX - REALISTIC ROAD VEHICLES**



I've got a huge collection of 1:76 scale vehicles and I want to reduce their shiny appearance.

Is there a way of doing this without repainting them?

**Mike says:** There's a really quick method to remedy this. Simply mask the glazing on your vehicle and spray it with an aerosol can of matt varnish. Or, for a really grimy look, don't mask the windows at all.

A final layer of weathering should really look the part, but you'd be surprised at just how effective the matt varnish appears on its own. Job done!



#### What's the best DCC controller?

It doesn't matter whether you're team diesel or steam, team 'OO' or 'N', or even team LNER or GWR, every layout needs a good control system. Thankfully, the hobby is jam-packed with great controllers to suit all budgets and preferences. 
#### PROTOTYPE QUESTION OF THE MONTH

I'm in the process of building a small First World War era diorama. The scene will feature a GWR weighbridge office and appropriate goods yard items. However, having read varying accounts, I'm wondering what colours the brick-built building would be? Also, would any fencing have been painted in GWR colours, too? Paul Bennett, by e-mail

**Chris says:** The mainstay of GWR building colours were two shades known as Stone No. 1 and Stone No. 3. These were mixed on site by the painter using a 'base' and pigments and matched to a colour swatch.

Naturally, with such a method the shades varied widely. The accompanying photograph shows the Great Western Society's interpretation of them on the corrugated iron shelter from Stockcross & Bagnor Halt. Around the First World War time, some embellishments such as door frames and panels might also be painted in a dark maroon colour.

Note that the fence is in a matching stone shade. Iron railing fences were usually in the darker stone shade but might also be black. Much was left to the judgement of the painter.

# HOW DO I REMOVE ACCIDENTAL GLUE DEPOSITS WITHOUT REMOVING PAINT?

I managed to smear blobs of cyanoacrylate onto the sides of a plastic item of rolling stock. Is there any means of safely removing the blobs of glue and perhaps even saving the paintwork?

**George says:** In most cases, it's best to allow the cyanoacrylate glue to harden completely before rubbing the surface with successively fine grades of abrasives. Micro Mesh sanding pads or Flex-i-File sticks are perfect, and these are available in various grades from Albion Alloys stockists.

For the best results, use with water wherever possible, as this acts as a lubricant and prevents the abrasives from clogging with dust. Used carefully, it may be possible to salvage the paintwork beneath, while the model's overall finish can be rendered more cohesive with a coat of clear varnish, to take your chosen sheen (satin, gloss, or matt).

If the glue stains have been left on bare plastic, resin, or metal, we can employ a cyano de-bonding agent, such as Roket Blaster from Deluxe Materials. A tiny drop, applied direct to the dried glue stain, will soften the cyano and the surface can then be wiped dry.

De-bonding agents are likely to soften paint and, if used excessively, can even attack soft plastics, so they need to be used with care. For full control, apply the agent with a needle-point applicator tip or, preferably, a small paintbrush.


In my demonstration, a plastic wagon kit was inadvertently placed onto a puddle of cyano glue. Ironically, the glue had been decanted onto a scrap of card for more accurate application via a cocktail stick. Proof that no matter how careful you are, you never beyond making a mistake!







It's usually best to allow the stray glue to dry fully. For unpainted surfaces, a cyano de-bonding agent, such as Glue Buster, from Deluxe Materials, will come to the rescue.



Decant a small amount of the de-bonding agent onto the dried glue, preferably with a pin-point applicator or small brush. Beware that some agents will attack painted finishes.

#### **TOOLS NEEDED**

- Small brush
- Pin-point applicator
- Cotton swabs



After a few minutes, wipe the surface with a damp cotton swab. If some glue remains, add another drop of de-bonder and leave for a few more minutes before wiping away.



Repeat the process until the surface is clear, wiping with dry swabs and leaving aside for a few hours for the solvent fumes to disperse before painting or adding fresh adhesive.



### **APPROACH INCLINES RIGHT**

I'm looking to install a 1-in-30 gradient on my new layout, but want to ensure that it's tested thoroughly before I fix it to the

baseboard. Is there a quick way of doing this or should I build a test piece?

Alex Wright. Oxfordshire

Chris says: I wrote at length regarding inclines in MR218, noting that model railway gradients are often steeper than their real-world counterparts. The steepest incline on the real railway is the Lickey Incline at 1-in-37, but it's certainly not uncommon to find a 1-in-30 gradient on a layout.

I will warn you, a 1-in-30 gradient is a *real* challenge for some models. My Hornby 'T9' can only haul three coaches on that same gradient on my layout - it's imperative that you test all of the locomotives that you intend to use on the incline.

Building test pieces in the same manner you intend to construct the gradient on your layout is surely the most thorough method of testing. But, if you're anything like me, that's a very long and very laborious task that you simply don't have the time or inlincation for (no pun intended).

My suggestion in MR218 was to fix a length of track to a piece of wood roughly the same length as the gradient on your layout, if possible.

You can then place blocks of varying heights at one end of the plank, experimenting with different gradients. To help you get started, a 1in block under an 8ft plank would equate to a 1-in-96 gradient and a 2in block would equate to a 1-in-48 gradient.

Just make sure that the plank of wood is rigid enough not to sag, as this will vary the intensity of your gradient, which should be constant. Now, if your gradient is going to have a curve, you'll want to recreate the curve when testing, too.

This was pointed out to me by reader, Tony Setter, who says: "If you're including curves within an incline, you will increase the resistance, and the risk of train slipage. It's vital to test all train combinations using the maximum gradient and minimum radius curve you intend to use."


Hopefully that will help you to avoid any gradient related issues in the future.

#### Tool of the month

#### The right tool for the job makes things easier, says **Dave Lowery**.

We live in an age where we're always rushing around, doing everything quicker and trying to save time. Well, none of that applies when drilling a hole in a model... If you're serious about modelling, a centre punch and set of numbered drill bits is a must. A centre punch creates a small indentation, which will guide the bit when you start drilling - helping to ensure the hole is drilled in the right place. Owning a range of drill bits will then ensure that your hole is always the correct size for the job.

> After using the centre punch, I'll start with a smaller bit to create a pilot hole, which helps guide a larger bit further.



It's easy to assume that Great Western Railway locomotives are all identical. That's not the case and the 'Dean Goods' is an absolute minefield of different boiler types, wheel diameters and tenders.

Mainline selected the typical 'Dean Goods' for its 1982 model. If you've ever seen preserved 'Dean Goods' No. 2516 in Swindon (either in STEAM or the old Faringdon Road museum), that's pretty much what Mainline's model looked like. It was a good model for its day but the time was ripe for a new 'Dean Goods' to modern standards. Oxford Rail accepted the challenge.

It announced three initial liveries: BR unlined black, GWR unlined green and No. 2309 in ornate lined garter livery. The latter is the first 'Dean Goods' to hit the shelves and that's what we have to review.

There's a rather splendid photograph of No. 2309 at Birmingham Snow Hill in April 1914 (www.warwickshirerailways. com/gwr/gwrbsh55.htm) and it reveals some of the compromises that Oxford has made. But let's look at the positives first.

The overall shape does have the quirky 'Dean Goods' shape: bulbous dome, curvaceous firebox sides and narrow and exposed cab. There are some neat areas - the hinged plate over the cylinders, the characteristic sandboxes by the smokebox and those swept-back cab footsteps.

The tender, the first ready-to-run offering of the early Dean 2,500 gallon type, is really well produced and its complex curves and angles matches the prototype. It has some fine - yet remarkably sturdy - handbrake handles and fire iron holder. Needless to say, it doesn't have a huge mound of moulded coal.

There are sprung metal buffers all-round - the springing has a good, firm effect - hinged metal fallplate and easy access to the eight-pin DCC socket. You just remove two screws under the tender and the body lifts clear.

That's the positive stuff. Where do things start to go wrong?



Niggles are the green plastic handrails that remain green where they should be black and the fact that the knobs

> are fixed horizontally to the boiler and not at an angle, which means that they obscure the washout plugs. The model also has Automatic Train Control (ATC) pipework on the running plate

valance when No. 2309 never received ATC.

NEM pockets

By the time of the Snow Hill photograph, No. 2309 had the 'B4' boiler with top feed. Oxford has modelled it as per this photograph, but with the wrong smokebox. 'Dean Goods' with 'B4' boilers retained a Deanstyle smokebox door with visible ring around the outer edge. The door ring itself was covered in snap head rivets. During the 1920s, the door ring was replaced with a pressed item which had no rivets, and a Churchward-style dished door.

The model has the 1920s smokebox with the pressed ring

but, to recreate No. 2309 in its 1914 condition, Oxford has simply replaced the door with a Dean ringed version.


Sprung buffers

You can tell a superheated 'Dean Goods' because the chimney sits further forward (to clear the superheater header). Our model has the chimney in the forward position (when compared to Colonel Templer's 4mm scale drawing published in JH Russell's A Pictorial Record of Great Western Engines Vol 1) but No. 2309 wasn't fitted with a superheater until 1922.

It's debatable whether No. 2309 would have still carried this livery at this time - the

#### Performance: 'Dean Goods'

It's a sweet runner! It was a little tight straight from the box but after running it for 30 minutes it settled down a treat. It managed 13 Bachmann and Hornby bogie coaches on straight, level track but the load had to be

reduced to nine to go through the tight curves and pointwork. Over the 1:60 gradient, it slipped with four bogies - but comfortably hauled three. However, it romped over the 1:30 with three bogies.




#### LACKING FINER DETAILS

The cab is another problem area. Oxford appears to have combined the side sheets from the original 'Dean Goods' with

the spectacle plate from those fitted with Belpaire fireboxes (the spectacle glasses were reduced in diameter). However, the change in firebox changed the side sheet profile. Oxford's doesn't have the deep section just under the roof (nor does it have the rear cross-member) and this means that the curved aperture is the

History
GWR Locomotive Superintendent William Dean will be forever linked to his 0-6-0s. Officially called '2301s', they were based on Joseph Armstrong's 'Standard Goods' 0-6-0s of 1866. Dean's were, however, a radical departure from traditional GWR practice as they had inside frames.

Some 260 were built, and though '28XX' 2-8-0s and '43XX' 2-6-0s took over 'top link' freight duties, there was still plenty of work to keep the little 0-6-0s employed. Their low weight made them suitable and popular on former Cambrian Railways. Batches were sent to Europe in both the First and Second World Wars, and survivors ended up as far away as Russia and China.

No. 2516 was withdrawn and saved in 1956 for official preservation at Swindon, while No. 2538 survived until 1957. Classmate No. 2531 was used at Longmoor for re-railing duties until 1959, although it hadn't steamed for nearly ten years!



sheets are completely flush.

The spartan nature of the cab means that firebox backhead is in full view. Much of the backhead is moulded and, at first glance, looks to be well painted but a few little annoyances appear: the tray above the firehole door does not protrude and, as such, has been painted to represent a piece of pipework. The black patch on the floorboards represents a metal plate, designed to protect the floor from impact from the firehole door flap. Full credit to Oxford for spotting this detail and painting it but, alas, the plate hasn't been modelled at all; you just get floorboards painted black.

Using scale drawings is risky because vou can't quarantee that whoever drew them got them 100% spot on. However, comparing the Dean Goods' to Colonel Templer's drawing reveals that the splashers are 1mm deeper than the prototype. This will be down to the thickness of the plastic used - a compromise imposed by the limitations of the manufacturing process - but it does reduce the gap for the cabside numberplate and makes it impose on the lining.

Oh, and that Snow Hill photograph suggests that

No. 2309 has a differently shaped reversing rod; it looks straight, whereas later locomotives had a curved rod.

#### LIVERY & BUILD QUALITY

The overall livery application is pretty good. The green is on the matt side but it's not drab. The lining is fine and the orange on the tender frames and running plate is easier on the eye than Bachmann's. The cabside numberplates have a pleasing level of relief.

It's irritating, therefore, that the underside of the boiler is black, because it's part of the chassis tooling and not the body. The Great Western lettering is accurate in shade and shape and the garter looks good from a distance. However, it doesn't match the high standard set by Bachmann's City of Bath (31-726).

The polished brass dome, safety valve bonnet and copper-capped chimney are made even more conspicuous thanks to the three 'shades' of polished metal. The most coppery shade is wrongly applied to the safety valve bonnet, while the copper cap is what can only be described as a 'muddy yellow'. The brass beading in front of the cab is silver rather than, well, brass.

Our sample had some build







quality issues. The brake pipe on the running plate is very fragile and the rear clip had broken.

A more serious issued affected the driver's side front footstep. It sticks out at quite an angle and it appears to have come out of the mould this way - there are no stress marks to show that it's been bent at a later stage. This could be an isolated incident but it may pay to check before you buy.

#### **COMPROMISE VS COST**

It may sound as though we're taking nit-picking to extreme levels but there's a reason that we've studied the 'Dean Goods' so closely and that's down to



what's written on the Oxford Rail box: In pursuit of excellence'

Bachmann and Hornby, don't make such claims so you'd expect a model manufacturer that does to produce something that's even better than you'd get from Barwell or Margate (now Sandwich). But that isn't the case with the 'Dean Goods'. The reason seems to be financial.

To make a model locomotive involves a considerable amount of money - some tens of thousands of pounds, in fact.

And every time you want to make a change - to offer alternative smokebox doors, for example, or different chimneys - that amount increases.

#### **Reviews**

It would appear that Oxford has limited the number of changes to keep the production costs and the RRP that you will pay down.

There is a range of prices attached to the 0-6-0 goods locomotives. Bachmann's GWR '2251' is at one end of the spectrum at £109.95 with the LNER 'J11' at the other with an RRP of £149.95. Oxford has positioned the 'Dean Goods' at the lower end of that scale (RRP is just £3 more than the '2251', at £112.95).

#### **WORTH BUYING?**

The big question is: should you buy an Oxford Rail 'Dean Goods'? Well, that all depends on what you want from a model locomotive. If you'd rather sacrifice prototype fidelity in order to save you a few pounds, then it's a really good buy. But if you want the ultimate 'Dean Goods' you're going to have to break out the tools - and even then it might be more economical to modify a Mainline model than an Oxford offering.

The best compromise, however, is to wait for Locomotion Models' limited edition of preserved No. 2516. Locomotion has worked with Oxford Rail to correct some of the issues, to produce a model worthy of the 'Locomotion Models' name. The cab has been retooled to an accurate profile - along with rivets and tip-up seats - and the smokebox has been tweaked too. It will also sport a high-gloss finish.

Production will be limited so get your order in quick.
Hopefully, these changes will be applied to mainstream 'Dean Goods' in the future. (RF)



uring the war, timber-built signal boxes at strategic locations were vulnerable to damage during bombing raids. As a result, more resilient and utilitarian structures were needed, with a number of slightly different designs emerging in the 1940s.

Sometimes referred to as 'ARP' types, many of these brick and concrete buildings appeared on the network. While they would win no prizes for aesthetics, they were quick to erect, durable, and a good few lasted into the privatised era.

The GWR's wartime design has been captured in a kit from

An assembly jig is provided to assist with building up the walls squarely - and, once the glue has cured, the structure is robust and attractive. The sliding windows have been captured well, with recessed panes and preformed holes for

the fitting of
wire handrails
(although wire
is not supplied).
A set of name
boards is
provided for
Hinksey South and

a basic lever frame is provided - also formed from laser-cut wood - although the holes do not match the levers, leaving the modeller to re-drill the frame. Another issue surrounds the floor and base, which are slightly too small. The resulting gap within the interior

was filled with offcuts of wood and this ensured that the walls gained the strength from the internal components, as the kit's instructions intend

These minor issues aside, the kit provided an enjoyable project spread over a number of evenings. A selection of oil-based wood dyes coloured the various parts prior to assembly, with detail work, such as the windows, painted later. With the addition of a full interior, this would make for a splendid addition to a post-1940s Western Region layout. (GD)

Wrought iron spear point railings have been a common trackside feature since Victorian times. Commonly installed at stations and yards, as well as on the boundaries of domestic dwellings and urban structures, they're an essential detail for many layouts.

4Ground has released a pack of laser-cut railings, rendered in a flexible card-type material and



**providing a** series of 85mm-long sections, totalling 1.3 metres. A variety of single and double gates with matching posts is also supplied.

The railings are an authentic 3ft 6in scale height and come pre-coloured in a pleasing anthracite-grey shade. However, the edges appear lighter than the outer faces, so a little touching in with paint will enhance the overall effect.

Simple to install, the sections can be joined readily with PVA or cyano glue, and the material is durable and able to withstand a little rough handling. The railings and gates really look the part and the pack offers great value for money. (GD)

achmann's model. commissioned exclusively by Kernow Model Rail Centre, follows the style of its earlier EMUs, as it's effectively an EMU without a mechanism. That means that there are full interiors in all four coaches. The flush-glazed plastic body captures the appearance of these vehicles well, which really marked the beginning of the end for the 1950-designed Mk 1 coach. Indeed, so good is the plastic body in its flushglazed matt BR blue finish that it looks like a top-quality, etched brass construction.

Care needs to be exercised to couple the cars in the correct order as shown in the instruction sheet, although the couplers are arranged in such a way that it would be difficult to get it wrong. The underside of the trailer brake coach carries three micro-switches that enable analog users to switch the interior and cab end

lights. If a 21-pin DCC decoder is fitted, DCC users can control these functions through the handset. The instruction leaflet includes information on decoder and sound installation.

The ends carry the prominent pantograph windscreen wipers and the recessed jumpers and hoses, as well as the twin roof-mounted air horns. Separate detail fittings are included but some of the air pipes should only be fitted if they don't interfere with coupler movement on curves.

The truss underframe and all the main equipment is neat and much of it is separately moulded, while the jacking/ lifting points above the bogies are crisp and tidily represented. The model runs on sharply detailed 'B4' bogies with metal wheelsets having insulated plastic axles. These provide electrical current collection for the on-board lighting and headcodes. The axles run in a metal bearing plate which



serves as a friction-free electrical pick-up.

Tension-lock couplers in NEM pockets are provided on the cab ends, but within the unit, Bachmann's standard, wired MU coupler is employed. This allows for interior lights and directional headcode lighting.

I was keen to see how the unit performed when being propelled, so I dug a Heljan Class 33/1 out of *Model Rail*'s cupboard and tested the complete unit on our test track. It performed faultlessly throughout the test, including being propelled at a good speed through the series of reverse curves formed by short radius points.

The model is offered in plain Rail blue, blue and grey, blue and grey with NSE branding, RTC blue and red (see p10), and in plain blue 'charter' livery. Our

the original flat finish Rail blue in which the vehicles were delivered. By this time, the brown underframe had been abandoned, and the model is finished with the blue carried down over the solebars. The finish is high quality but inevitably a little drab in this particular livery, although it does emphasise the orange curtains which were a feature of new BR stock at this time. Lettering is

present and legible. This four-car unit is certainly not cheap, but with fully lit coaches now nudging up to the £60-70 mark, it's no more than we might expect for a model of this calibre. (CJL)

**Interior detail** 

Internally, we're not yet quite at the stage of having printed antimacassars in First Class and mirrors on the bulkheads, but nor do we have the generic toffeecoloured, one-piece interior moulding of old. The seats are of typical

Mk 1 coach shape with high backs and finished in blue, with the compartment walls in a beige colour. There are tan-coloured tables and the outer cars have detailed cab interiors in the distinctive pale blue-green of the day. The orange curtains are even printed with the folds and creases in them. Windows carry legible 'First Class' and 'No Smoking' labels as appropriate.

#### History

Though classified as EMUs, the '4-TCs' were four-car control trailer units converted from Mk 1 coaches, the Southern Region having swapped stock with other regions (including exchanging Bulleid coaches) for the best of their Mk 1s. With a driver's cab at each end and gangwayed First and Second Class accommodation, the units were built for the Bournemouth-Weymouth route. This section was not included in the Bournemouth electrification scheme.

Power was provided by a '4-REP' EMU on the electrified section and at Bournemouth the '4-TC' set (or sets) were detached and taken forward in push-pull fashion by a Class 33/1 diesel-electric. In the Up direction, the train would be driven from the



leading unit, with the 33/1 pushing in the rear. BR built 34 '4-TCs'. Originally numbered 401-434, they were re-numbered 8001-8034. Classified '491' under TOPS, they were reclassified '438' before withdrawal. They were replaced by Class 442 EMUs.



# Oxford Rail 'Carflat' bogie wagon

here's an unwritten law in this hobby: if you spend time building or converting a particular item, as soon as you've finished it, a ready-to-run version will be announced.

So it was proved when I converted a Hornby Mk 1 coach chassis into a 'Carflat' car-carrying wagon in the April 2015 issue of *Model Rail*. Soon afterwards, both Bachmann and Oxford Rail announced that they would produce ready-to-run 'Carflats'. Avoiding duplication, Oxford went for the 60ft version, built on old LMS carriage underframes, while Bachmann chose the longer BR Mk 1-based version.

Both types had a crossplanked wooden floor with a low railing around it, capable of accommodating four cars or vans, held in place by wooden chocks nailed to the wagon floor. A hinged plate at the ends of the wagon dropped down onto the buffers, enabling cars to be driven into position, along the length of the train. Some of the Mk 1-based wagons had a section of the side railing which could be removed to allow cars to be loaded from the side also. These were required for locations such as the Severn Tunnel car ferry service, where vehicles were side-loaded from the station platforms at Pilning

and Severn Tunnel Junction.

#### WEIGHING IN

First to reach the shops is the Oxford version, and we've received an example in BR bauxite as B748747 for review. Weighing in at 77g, the wagon is assembled from crisply detailed plastic mouldings but clearly has some metal weight concealed between the floor and the underframe. The model runs on 9ft wheelbase LMS bogies from which the outer end stretcher has been omitted in order to clear the NEM coupler pocket. which is mounted on a sprung close-coupling cam arrangement. The bogies have brake blocks in line with the wheel

There's not much bulk to

a 'Carflat' so the opportunities for detailing are quite limited, but every opportunity seems to have been taken to apply separately fitted details. The

truss underframe is neatly moulded and carries

Vacuum cylinders, V-hangers and a representation of the brake rigging, which even includes an adjuster. The ends are impressively detailed, with

large-headed blackened metal bufferheads (not sprung), separate lamp irons and separate metal hoops for the bump stops, which would rest on the bufferstocks when the ends were lowered.

According to the neatly printed builder's plate, this wagon was built at Derby in 1964 on Lot No. 3535. Other printed detail includes the load limit - '10tons evenly distributed' and 'No loose shunting' warnings on both the solebars and ends.

#### **OPTIONAL EXTRAS**

A bag of detail parts includes 16 yellow chocks (four per car) and two brake pipes which can only be fitted if they don't interfere with bogie swing on your curves. The chocks have a small pin on one side, which suggests that the deck should be drilled to accept them and the cars permanently mounted on the

wagon, as chock position will vary according to the type of car.

Although 'Carflats' were usually coupled in complete trains or on the rear of coaching stock, I tested our sample, empty, over complex trackwork, with the weight of five coaches behind it. The model performed faultlessly throughout the tests. The empty wagon has clearly been kept as light as possible to allow for the weight of four cars when it is run loaded.

Oxford Rail's 'Carflat' is a neat and accurate model of a wagon which has not been offered ready-to-run since Tri-ang-Hornby days, and which is specific to a very distinct BR period from the 1960s to the 1980s. (CJL)

# Bachmann 60ft 'birdcage' coaches

erhaps the most
eagerly awaited rolling
stock in recent years
has been the South
Eastern & Chatham Railway
'Birdcage' coaching stock from
Bachmann, if only to provide
appropriate stock for the
Wainwright 'C' to haul.

The SECR, pressed by capacity issues on its trains, was among the first railways to stretch coaching stock designs to 60ft. This created greater end-throw, and meant that guard's look-out duckets could not be accommodated within gauge, so the SECR opted for a minimal guard's compartment with a raised roof which reflected the European style of cupola, but became known here as a 'birdcage'.

Examples of SECR
'Birdcage' stock
rescued from
departmental service
and from the Longmoor Military Railway
have been superbly

restored by both the Kent & East Sussex Rallway and the Bluebell where, doubtless, Bachmann went to research the threecoach set which they have now released in model form.

The three-coach set consists of a Brake Third lavatory/ Composite Lavatory/Brake Third without lavatory, and the sample supplied to us depicts the set in early BR unlined crimson, on which I will comment later.

#### 'SPLENDID RENDITION'

Bachmann is establishing itself as the top-end manufacturer in terms of the level of detail and separately applied parts. Perhaps this began as a reaction to Hornby's move down the detail stakes with its ill-fated 'Design-Clever'. Whatever the reason, the 'Birdcage' coaches move Bachmann up another rung on that ladder. Inevitably there's a price to be paid for this level of quality and detail, and there's no doubt that these models warrant a high value-for-money rating in

spite of that. They are a truly splendid rendition of what became known as 'Ashford Gothic' thanks to the shape of the windows, with their rounded top corners and square lower corners.

The character of that shape has been finely captured with droplights, vents and panelling all neatly represented. Indeed, the external beading, with its squared corners, is exquisite and is topped off by separately fitted handralls and curly grab handles.

On the roofs, the 'birdcages' are glazed front and back. I wondered how the guard got up high enough to see out. Clearly, the decorator's plastic milk crate was a non-starter, so was there a step of some sort in the guard's van - or did the SECR simply employ tall guards? The answer is there if you peer through the windows, as there's a double step at the outer end of the guard's van.

The rest of the interior is equally well represented with the unusual layout in the two lavatory vehicles which allowed toilet access from some compartments and not others. In addition, the composite features an open saloon section in part of the First Class accommodation. Here, only some First Class passengers had toilet access, while one First and two Third Class compartments did not. Whatever the class of passenger, some were clearly more 'equal' than others!



Returning to the exterior, the ends have generously wide steps, separate handrails and brake pipes, and excellent moulded renderings of the big round buffers. Separately fitted torpedo roof vents top off the roofs; 18 or even 21 of them, depending on the vehicle type.

The 8ft wheelbase bogies have crisp detailing and

wide footsteps. They run on insulated metal wheels running in bearing plates which also serve as pick-ups for lighting. Tension-lock couplings

are fitted in NEM pockets mounted on the now-customary close-coupling cams which draw the coaches closer together on straight track. However, they still leave a gap of around 7mm between bufferheads. Running on our test track we found no fault in the running either, and the

set of three worked easily through complex trackwork without any problems.

Our samples are in BR livery so they carry limited lettering - just the numbers, 'Guard' and First Class markings on the doors, all of which are neatly applied. Look closely at the ends of the brake cars and the length and data markings in white are all fully legible - but you'll need a magnifier to read them! First Class lozenges are applied to appropriate windows and the very limited non-smoking accommodation, typical of the 1950s, is also marked with window stickers.

#### **GILDED CAGE**

It is almost impossible to fault these models, but I do have one reservation. Not for the first time in ready-to-run models does the shade of red disappoint. Representing the crimson ('blood' of 'blood and custard') of the early 1950s, to my eye it looks closer to the unlined margon of the 1960s, by which time these coaches had been withdrawn or passed into departmental stock. Check out www.preservation. kesrorg uk/coaching-stock/se-cr to see just how bright this red could be. However, Bachmann's shade is closer to that used by Hornby on its ex-LSWR stock, so that may well please Southern modellers who run both types.

In short, these coaches continue the very high standard set by recent Bachmann products. I hope that, in due course, we shall see them in one of the more elaborate liveries. (CJL)

#### 'TINNISWOOD'

#### Neville Davies, Preston

'Tinniswood' is named after the late, great comedy writer Peter Tinniswood, whose various books, TV and radio programmes have given me much pleasure over the years.


I've always been fascinated by Colonel Stephens' railways but I do not have sufficient faith in my ability to attempt to accurately model any particular prototype. Peter Tinniswood's *Tales from a Long Room* are narrated by 'The Brigadier' and I've taken the name of the main station from his village in that work.

The mix of locomotives and rolling stock is eclectic. Although there are scale models on both the standard and narrow gauge railways, most of the models are freelance, scratchbuilt or kit-bashed. An impulse purchase of a Stephen Pool (now Peco) Glyn Valley Tramway O-4-2T led me to start modelling in 'O-16.5'.

'Tinniswood' was
originally intended only as
a narrow gauge railway.
However, having chanced upon
'Castle Rackrent' in its original form,
I realised that, by slightly widening the
baseboards, standard gauge could be
incorporated; hence the branch from
'Warton Tower'.


The standard gauge points and dual gauge trackwork were made to order by Marcway. All other visible narrow gauge track is Peco 'O-16.5' and Streamline 'OO' gauge. The





majority of the standard gauge track is Rivarossi 'O' gauge flexi, which has what appears to be aluminium based alloy rail which needs little or no cleaning.

I also have a tramway, where three trams can run at a time. Two are initially positioned at the town terminus and one in the fiddlevard. The first leaves the terminus and travels for a short distance before slowing to a halt outside the cinema. After a short wait (variable as required), it continues up the slope to cross the branch by a bridge and enters the vacant fiddleyard road. The fiddleyard points change as they are cleared, the tram coming to a halt in an end section protected by a diode to prevent overrun. After another (variable) pause the other tram leaves the fiddleyard and performs this sequence in the opposite direction.




#### **Scratching a HST itch**

#### 'Kirby'

'Kirby' is a fictitious town in the late 1950s/early 1960s. The station serves an Eastern Region line that's connected to the London Midland Region.

In reality, it's an 'N' gauge layout in an 11ft by 6ft garden shed. It's loosely based on Ipswich station and is my first attempt at modelling. Still very much a work in progress, it's fully illuminated with

street lights, working Belisha beacons, traffic lights, emergency vehicles and even a police phonebox. All the buildings have internal lights.

That said, there are still more buildings to install. I also want to add signals, remote control to the 42 points - and even pluck up the courage to weather some of my stock.





# **'Carlton in Dale'**John Gill, Bewdley, Worcestershire

This layout is based on a location on the borders of West Yorkshire and Lancashire. It's a basic 'tail-chaser', which has taken over 20 years to build and has endured three changes of address.

Stock is based on the Eastern and Midland Region in the 1950s, and I have over 50 locomotives. An exception is a GWR goods train headed by a pannier tank. This was inspired by a day on the footplate of the Severn Valley Railway's No. 7714, where I'm a guide at its Highley Engine House.

'Carlton in Dale' is sited in the centre of the village with numerous cameo activities, including the weekly refuse collection, window cleaners in action and a small group enjoying a brew at the café. There are over 100 figures in one area.

# **How to Build a landscape**

### RAISE THE TRACKBED

The real railway wasn't built on a flat landscape; it was built through the landscape. Use Woodland Scenics SubTerrain Foam Sheets to raise the trackbed which will allow you to model embankments and bridges over roads and rivers.

### **EFFECTIVE PLASTER CLOTH**

As plaster cloth dries, use a wet brush to spread the plaster and fill any gaps to give it a uniform finish. For a smoother surface, mix a little DIY plaster (Polyfilla) to a thin liquid and spread this over the bandage with a brush. Paint to ensure that the white does not show through.

### **GIVE TUNNELS SOME DEPTH**

We don't always have the space to model a full tunnel, but you can create the illusion in a small space by making a liner. Stone- or brick-embossed Plastikard can be painted, weathered and formed into a liner before also being glued to the baseboard and the portal.

### **BEAUTIFUL BACKSCENE**

A good backscene should focus the eye on the layout rather than its surroundings, add visual depth - especially to layouts with narrow baseboards - and gives a feeling of looking at a real-life scene. Try ID Backscenes' photographic backscenes.

### **GET THE GEAR**

Geoscenics plaster bandage is sold in different sizes (by weight). A 100g pack provides enough to cover about a 1sq/m. Cut the bandage into small sections and submerge in water before applying. Price: £5.50. Availability: www.geoscenics.co.uk

# **How to Detail your track**

### **CHOOSE YOUR BALLAST**

Ballast takes on many different colours and textures, so check what's used on the stretch of railway that you're modelling and select the right miniature ballast accordingly; there's huge choice from synthetic materials to real crushed rock. Sieved sand offers a realistic alternative.

### **APPLY THE GLUE**

Mist your track with water and a drop of washing-up liquid before gluing. Use a pipette, eyedropper or syringe and pin-point applicator to apply the diluted PVA glue to the ballast. Don't disturb the material. Allow a few days for the glue to set.

# **TONE DOWN YOUR TRACK**

Real rails are only shiny when they're freshly rolled, and sleepers and ballast will soon take on a worn look with prolonged exposure. Paint your rail sides with a rust colour while a couple of light coats of RailMatch Sleeper Grime will sort out your sleepers, by giving them that authentic look.

# **GET THE RURAL LOOK**

To recreate steam era track, paint and ballast your track as normal. Then press DAS modelling clay over the ballast and sleepers. Pack it into place with a stiff brush. Leave it to fully dry and then paint as required.

### **GET THE GEAR**

After ballasting, painting and weathering track, you must clean the rail tops otherwise you'll impair the performance of your trains. Peco's PL-41 Rail Cleaner is ideal. Price: £3.75. Availability: www. kernowmodelrailcentre.com

# **How to Create greenery**

### **MATS MATTER**

Don't dismiss the idea of using grass mats. They're not the bland, uniform things of yesteryear but even one of these can be perfect for the base layer of scenery. You can improve it with subsequent layers of static grass and tufts.

# **FLOWERS ARE SIMPLE**

To create a patch of vibrant scarlet poppies or sunny yellow daffodils, or indeed whatever flowers you fancy, sprinkle some tiny pieces of suitably coloured foam scatter through your fingers on top of wet hairspray on your landscape. Seal them with another light coating.

### **NATURE'S NOT UNIFORM**

You can't take a swatch to your lawn to find a correct 'grass' colour. To replicate the myriad colours nature bestows on the landscape, mix different colours of static grass in your applicator. Make sure you also apply grass fibres of different heights. WW Scenics offers one of the best ranges of lengths and colours.

# **TREE RESTORATION**

Miniature trees can fade with age. To restore their vibrancy. give them a coat of extra-hold hairspray and sprinkle on a selection of new scatters. These will stick to the hairspray and make your tree look new.

# **GET THE GEAR**

There are loads of grass applicators out there, but Noch's Gras-Master is a top choice (£129.95, www.gaugemaster. com). Use it with WWS' New Pro Grass Micro Static Grass Applicator (£48.99, www.war-world.co.uk) and you'll be able to add static grass anywhere.



# **How to Make water**

### **GET THE RIGHT COLOUR**

With the water feature built below baseboard level and the bank smoothed out with plaster, a few coats of acrylic paints will seal the porous surface and provide an undercoat for the bed. Use darker colours towards the centre to create depth.

# **DON'T FORGET...**

Consider a water feature like any other scene and make it as detailed as you can. Don't forget reeds and rushes, stones and rocks in the deeper water and, if you're modelling an urban setting, the odd discarded shopping trolley. Fix all of these features with PVA.

### **POUR GENTLY**

Gently pour your water fluid onto the baseboard and let it run into the corners. Make sure that the baseboards are absolutely flat when doing this to ensure the 'water' only goes where it's supposed to. Always pour thin layers and allow each to dry before adding the next.

# **KEEP THE DUST AT BAY**

When you are happy that all is well and there are no air bubbles, cover the pond with a box lid and leave it well alone for 24 hours to dry. If you want ripples, wait for around nine hours before gently teasing the surface with a clean toothbrush.

### **GET THE GEAR**


