PROGRESS REPORT FROM **REVOLUTION TRAINS**





Revolution Trains used the 2017 International N Gauge Show on September 9/10 to bring 'N' gauge enthusiasts up to date with the numerous projects that it has under way.

It revealed that after more than two years in development, the Class 390 'Pendolino' is now in production, and that its Class B 35t tank wagon has reached the decorated sample stage; the final samples will be displayed at Warley in November and the order book closed shortly afterwards.

It also said that its KFA container flat has been tooled and is ready for production, and that once liveries have been finalised the order book will be closed, probably around Christmas.

Meanwhile, design work for the IZA Cargowaggon Twin is





complete, with tooling to start imminently, while an engineering sample of its Class 92 will be undergoing close inspection. Once approved, the order book will be closed and the models put into production.

He added that the only part of the locomotive not to be weathered will be the driving wheels, in order to minimise disruption to electrical contacts.

Lots in Common

Over 7,000 people attended Great Western Railway's open day at Old Oak Common depot on September 2. 'OOC' has been a major locomotive servicing point since 1906, but will cease servicing HSTs next year because the site is being redeveloped as a major Crossrail-HS2 interchange hub.

To celebrate, the present GWR brought together classic Western steam and diesel power to rub shoulders with its fleet of today and tomorrow (Class 800). Here are some of the highlights.

Right: HST power car 43093 was named Old Oak Common HST Depot 1976-2018 and was sporting this striking livery depicting the main line at the September 2 open day, featuring silhouettes of a Class 800, Class 180, Class 43, Class 50, 'Western', 'Warship', 'Modified Hall' and 'King'.





GWR gave 57604 *Pendennis Castle* a fresh coat of paint for the event, showing off many elements of its retro Great Western scheme: nameplate, 'garter crest' plaque, GWR coat of arms and orange and black lining. The 'PDN' on the solebar pays homage to the way GWR applied shed allocation details to steam locomotives.



There was a distinct 1990s theme in one corner of the site, as D05 Preservation's Class 47 47828, recently repainted into InterCity 'swallow' livery, was posed next to GWR's HST powercar 43185 *Great Western*, which received this classic scheme in 2016.



Kernow Model Rail Centre launched four new limited editions from its stand at the Old Oak Common open day on September 2, including its first ever joint project with Hornby.

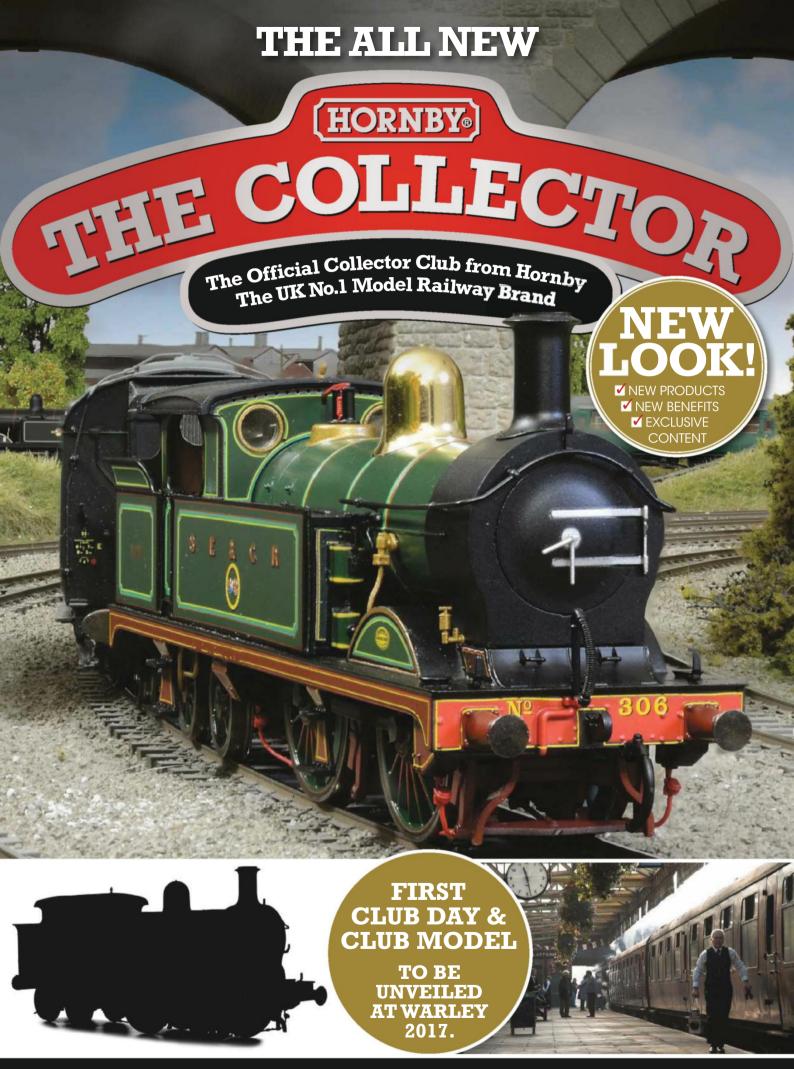

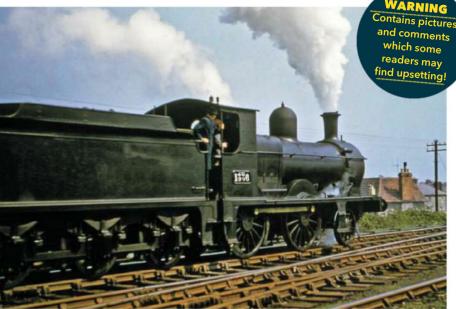
There's nothing more retro than a good kit-bashing project. Oxford Rail's 'Dean

Goods' 0-6-0 attracted some controversy, so **Chris Leigh** ponders whether he could kit-bash it into something a little different.

know we old 'uns keep saying that today's modellers have it all on a plate, that they can buy every locomotive they could wish for, ready-to-run. The hardest part of modelling today is opening the packaging. Sorry folks, but I'm afraid it's true. These days, you fill in a wish list, wait a couple of years, and hey presto!, there's the locomotive you asked for. It wasn't always like that.

I started as a teenage modeller in the 1960s. I'd been given a Hornby-Dublo three-rail train set for Christmas 1955. It was the BR '4MT' 2-6-4T, some wagons, an oval of track and a siding. I started trainspotting during one summer holiday. It wasn't very demanding. The railway ran past the side of our house. I sat in the garden and took the numbers of steam locomotives taking freights to and from Feltham yard. I bought an Ian Allan 'Abc' book and started underlining the numbers. But I soon wanted to see more - and different - locomotives. My mum suggested that my brother and I should take the train from Staines to Weybridge. We'd lived there, right beside the line, before the move to my gran's house, between Staines and Egham.

At Weybridge, I saw Bulleid 'Pacifics' - lots of them. So when Hornby-Dublo introduced one in model form it was the catalyst that really started me off in railway modelling. I sent a photograph of No. 34109 Sir Trafford Leigh-Mallory heading the 3.54pm Clapham Gate-Exeter Central milk empties to Meccano Magazine, pointing out that you could model that train using the Hornby-Dublo 'West Country' and six-wheel milk tanks. It was a defining moment. I had started on the road to becoming a railway modeller and I'd had my first article published.

I was on the slippery slope, motorising Airfix and Kitmaster kits – or trying, at least – and adapting models to create something closer to the prototype that I wanted to model, because I'd exhausted the available ready-to-run types.

Tri-ang and Trix were not compatible with Hornby-Dublo, so I was limited to around half a dozen different locomotives. I had the '4MT', a pre-war 'Duchess' and an 'A4', a 'Castle' and the 'West Country'. I disposed of the LMS and LNER locomotives for £1 each at a school fête. I bought a Gaiety 0-6-0PT from Hatton's to boost my Western 'fleet' and that was it. After that it was a question of "what can I buy and carve up to represent something else?"

It's been 30 or 40 years since I last considered a major carve-up of a model locomotive, but there's one potential project that's been niggling at me.

The Midland & South Western Junction Railway, which has been a personal favourite for nearly as long as I've been in this business, had three Dubs-built 2-4-0 tender locomotives, built in 1894. They passed to the GWR at Grouping and Swindon revamped them with the No. 11 boiler. They were retained by BR

primarily to work the Lambourn branch (another personal favourite), until the mid-1950s. I find that I sometimes have to look twice at photographs to distinguish between the Dean 0-6-0 and the modified MSWIR locomotives (Nos. 1334-1336).

So, could I hack an Oxford 'Dean Goods' into a 2-4-0? It's going to be a likeness, not a perfect model and, clearly, the rivet counters and forum critics will need to look

the other way. As *Model Rail* passes its 20th birthday and I approach my 55th year in the business of writing model railway articles, it might be nice to turn the clock back, just this once.

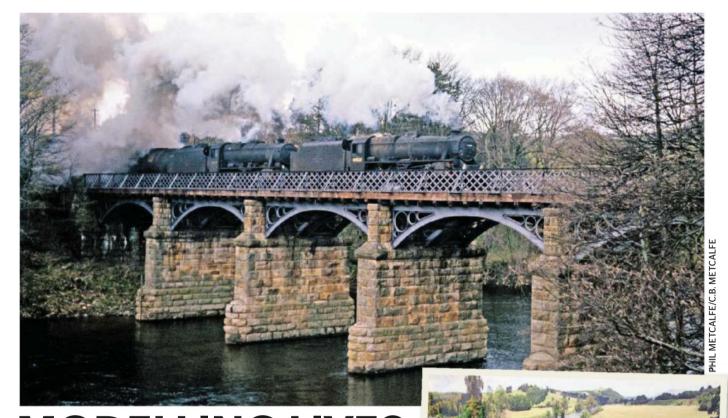

Tales from the miniature world.



The catalyst for Phil Metcalfe's return to the hobby was a single photograph...

ver the years, I've tried to get back into the practical side of the hobby on a number of occasions, although the demands of real life have usually scuppered my attempts. With two young sons, I had a good excuse to dust off my old 'OO' and 'N' gauge stock as we set

about building a couple of rudimentary train sets and a fledgling layout or two.

I even managed to board out the attic, with a view to installing a 'proper' layout up there, out of the way of everyday family life. And yet I just couldn't get started.

It's not as if I've been short of inspiration. In my day job I have to travel around the country capturing images and footage of real trains. And I've also spent years filming Model Rail's team of experts for countless DVD programmes, picking up plenty of hints and tips along the way.

But the final push came courtesy of a single photograph. While sorting and digitising my late father's massive collection of railway slides, I happened upon a wonderful 1960s image of a pair of 'Black Fives' crossing the Crook of Lune, near Halton, on the former Midland route from Lancaster Green Ayre to Wennington.

The more I studied the image, the more I started thinking about how I could go about scratchbuilding the viaduct. Then I thought 'what the heck, just build it!' And I did, initially on the kitchen table. But it seemed such a shame not to be able to run trains over it.

So that was that. I was committed to building the layout I'd been dreaming of for

years. Featuring part of the 'Little' North Western Halton line on one side of the room and Carnforth shed and station on the other, the layout has been progressing steadily over the past few years.

Dad's photo archive has provided a treasure trove of prototype inspiration for both weathering and renumbering to either Carnforth or Green Ayre-allocated locomotives; my aim was to recreate the real trains that passed along these routes in the BR steam era.

It helped that a good friend was also hoping to return to railway modelling around the same time, so we've egged each other on. The mutual support has been great. We've even started our own

WhatsApp group with a few other mates, where we share images of our latest modelling efforts. The social aspect has been welcome too, as our families regularly meet up for running nights.

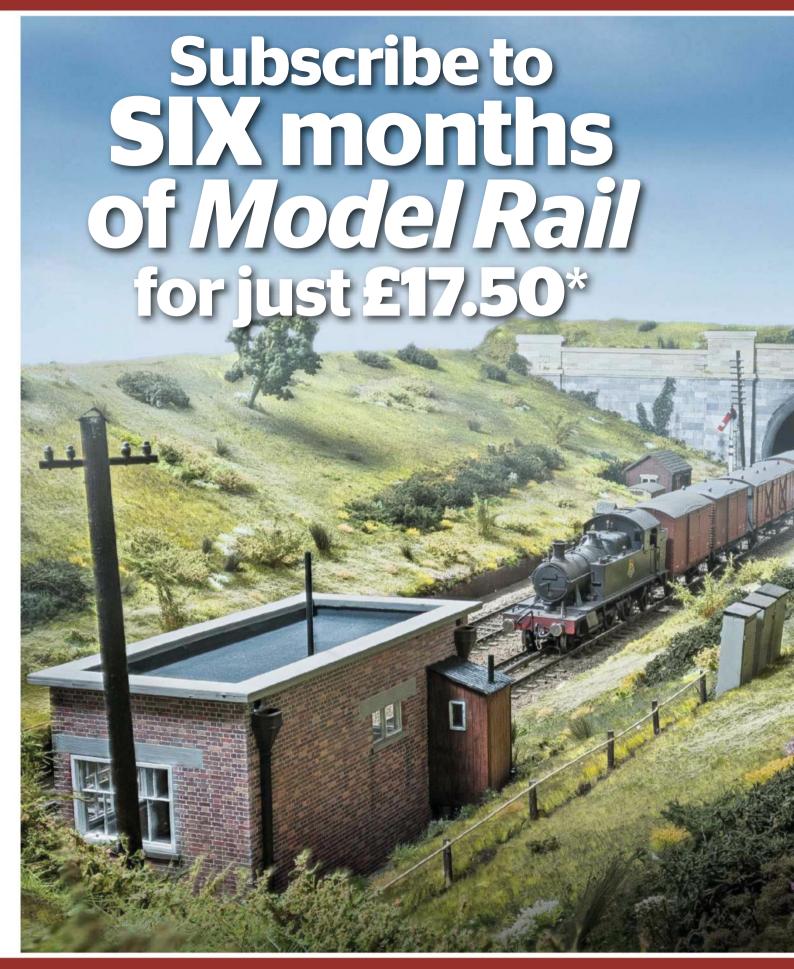
It may have taken a while, but getting back into railway modelling has been hugely rewarding.

appears when we least expect it!

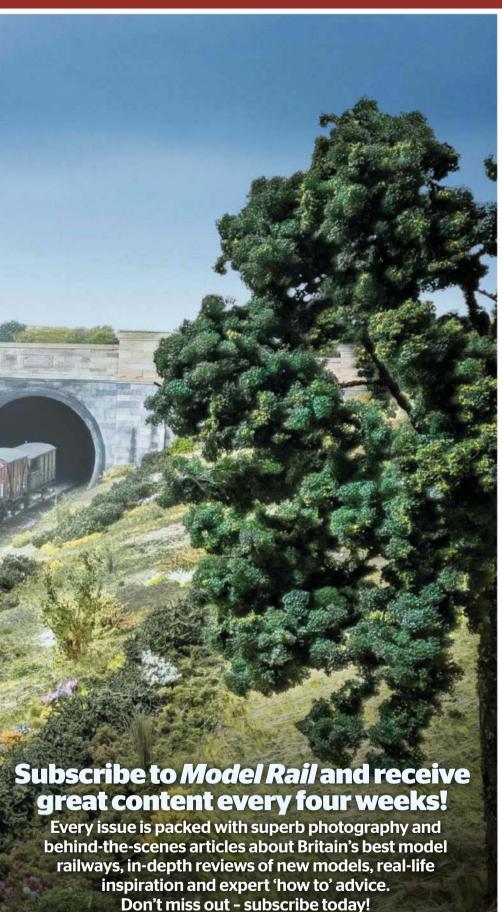

ig layouts can be even bigger commitments; opt for a micro layout and you'll likely be finished within a year – sometimes less. But large layouts like Robin Sweet's 'A Nod to Brent' (14ft by 7ft 10in) can take years to complete, and even then there's always something to fix, upgrade or amend. The solution? Make sure you choose a subject that's going to retain your interest for the long haul.

The reasons why Robin chose to build a model of Brent station are many, but his main connection with the subject matter is deeply personal. "My father used to live in nearby Kingsbridge when he was a lad," he explains. "Brent station is a model he

would have built if he were still alive, so it's something of an homage."

Robin also shares his father's affinity with the prototype, and has found much to enjoy since he started the build way back in 2003. He explains why: "It's a GWR main line station with a branch line, which means I can run a variety of stock. The main line caters for my love of fast express trains, which I can leave to run round while I shunt the yard."

The name 'A Nod to Brent' is derived from the compromises Robin has been forced to make along the way. His nod to the prototype has certainly worked; the key hallmarks of the station are all there

– it couldn't be anywhere else! The layout should prove inspirational to anyone who's ever dismissed the idea of modelling a prototype layout because of space restrictions.

EASY LIVING

Since starting the project in 2003, Robin has observed a sharp rise in the quality of specialist scenic products. "It's much easier now than it used to be," he says. "The past five or six years have been a giant leap in terms of availability and quality – it's good for the hobby."

An example of such advancements are the laser-cut flowers that adorn the station, but Robin isn't averse to turning back the clock. "The laser-cut flowers are from Noch, but flock and a touch of paint still works well", he says.

Robin is also an advocate of carved polystyrene covered in plaster of Paris bandage. He explains why: "It's an old method, but it still works. Once it's dry, I'll paint it green or brown and then cover it in Green Scene's Grass Mat. The finishing touch is a few static grass fibres, applied using a Noch Puffer Bottle and secured with a misting of hairspray.

BESPOKE BOUTIQUE

There's no questioning the merits of Robin's scenery, and the buildings leave no doubt as to the prototype location. The layout houses a mixture of modified kit-built and bespoke laser-cut structures, the latter built by DJ Modelmaking Services' David Amias.

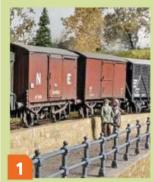
"David is a professional model maker. He built the buildings on the platforms and the overbridge," says Robin. "He sends me the buildings in kit form, leaving me to assemble and paint them."

The buildings were produced from authentic drawings, but Robin was forced to compromise on the length of each canopy: "If a building's too big you're forced to cut it down. Any changes can't be too drastic or you'll lose the building's essence. I had to shorten each canopy, but was happy with the result – it's about what you can live with."

Robin's painting regime is an undercoat of Halfords Primer Grey, followed by layers of Phoenix Precision Paints; the station buildings are clad in the classic GWR Stone No. 1 (P21) and No. 3 (P22) shades and really look the part.

Weathering has become something of a subculture within the hobby. There's a multitude of different techniques with which to

What makes this layout great?



Robin's attitude towards model making is almost as impressive as his work. How many of us talk the talk but never walk the walk? I've always approached new ground with caution - but not Robin. He tackled 'A Nod to Brent' head-on, and the result is a GWR through station that any modeller would be proud of.



I tend not to bother. For me, less is more."

Despite his stance on weathering, Robin has heavily weathered the water tower and an old barn to reflect their age. The barn is an old Wills Kit, as Robin explains: "It's supposed to look old and run-down, so I weathered it. I tend to dry-brush, although I'm into using weathering powders at the moment too."

The water tower is a Mike's Models kit and has



been treated to a layer of rust. "The building was painted using Phoenix Precision Dark Rust (P951)," says Robin. "I then stippled Humbrol Maskol onto the areas I wanted to look rusty. Once the whole model had been painted and was dry, I used a stiff brush to remove the Maskol, revealing the rusty surface beneath."

HARD KNOCKS

'A Nod to Brent' wasn't without its challenges; the relatively large 14ft by 7ft 10in footprint demanded a lot of baseboard work. But Robin rose to the challenge,

Scenery is the glue that holds a model landscape together, but it's very often the buildings that identify a prototype layout's exact location. Robin has spent time and effort to ensure that the buildings on 'A Nod to Brent' accurately depict the real Brent station, and he has a few tips to help you out too.



Never underestimate the value of mock-up buildings. They're easy to make and provide an accurate, tactile visual aid as to where new buildings and surrounding details should go.



Robin commissioned DJ Modelmaking Services' David Amias to create the station buildings and overbridge from scale drawings. The buildings arrived in pieces, making them easier for Robin to paint.



Robin has been careful not to leave an unsightly gap between the bottom of his buildings and the surface on which they stand. This image shows how he's inset the signal box to ensure a snug fit.

Historical factfile: **Brent station**

'A Nod to Brent' is set during the 'Big Four' era, a time when activity in and around Brent station was at its peak.

The station served the Devonshire village of South Brent, situated at the southern perimeter of Dartmoor. It opened as part of the South Devon Railway in June 1848, despite the line itself opening around a month prior.

On February 1 1876, the South Devon Railway became a constituent of the GWR. At the end of 1893 the Kingsbridge branch line opened, joining the South Devon Main Line via the introduction of a junction at Brent station.

The Kingsbridge branch line lasted until September 1963, and Brent's goods traffic ceased operation shortly after in April of 1964 - passenger

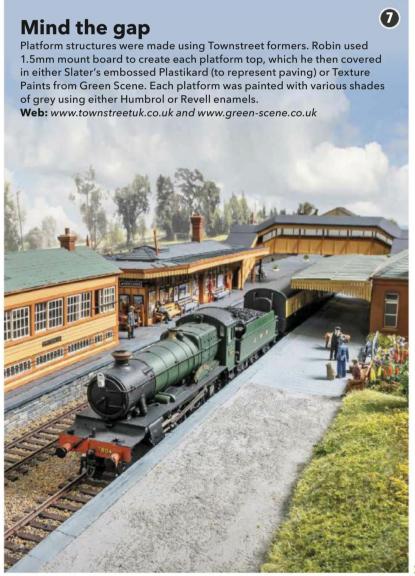


services followed suit in October.

Today, only the goods shed remains, following the demolition of the signal box on November 12 2014 (which had continued to operate until December 1973).

Robin often runs visiting Southern Railway stock on 'A Nod to Brent', and there's a practical reason why: SR traffic was often diverted onto the South Devon Main Line *en route* to or from Plymouth.

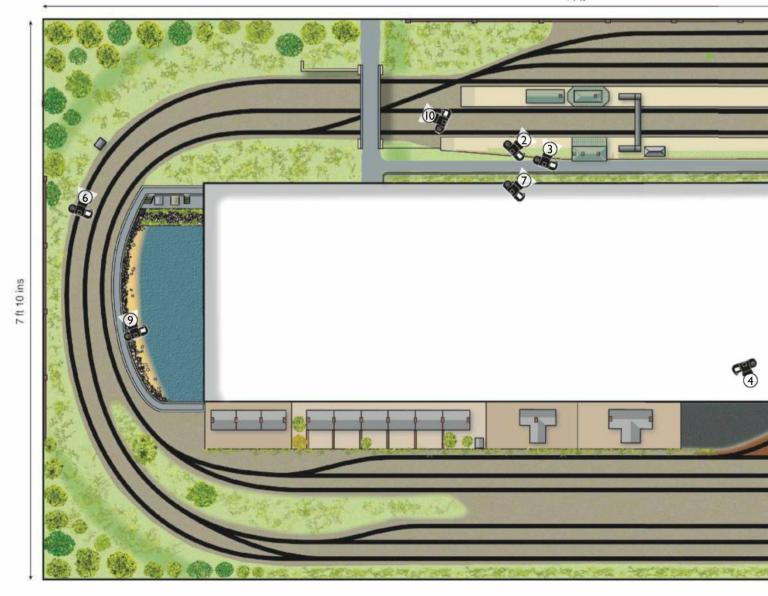
despite having never built his own baseboards before. "I used 3ft by 1ft bracing with a plywood top," he explains. "I actually found it quite straightforward – the trick is not to rush things. I'm pleased because this is my first attempt and it's stood for over a decade."

Some challenges weren't quite so simple. Robin remembers his experience painting the retaining wall: "It was a nightmare. I decided to install it first and then paint it... All I needed to do was apply an undercoat, pick out a few individual bricks and finish off with some dry-brushing. But with the retaining wall *in situ*, I had to lean awkwardly over the layout while maintaining a steady hand – not recommended!"

Water proved equally as frustrating, and that's something many modellers can sympathise with. Robin still isn't happy with his efforts, despite the fact that the *Model Rail* team thinks the water looks grand. I can certainly relate to my own efforts when modelling water (MR228). Very often we're our own biggest critics.

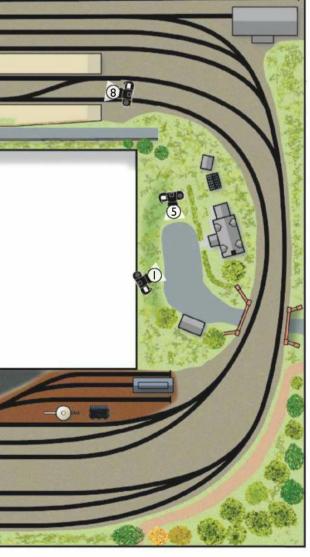
There's no disputing the effectiveness of Robin's method: "The colour is paint, applied directly onto the baseboard, and I used a mixture of browns and greens. Just don't use blue – everyone assumes water is blue but it never is!" Once the paint had cured, Robin layered Woodland Scenics Realistic Water on top.

MODELLER CV: ROBIN SWEET

Robin and his father shared a passion for model railways. He had a train set when he was a child in the 1970s, but it was a chance encounter that brought him back to the hobby years later. "My father and I were passing a model shop in Warwick - over 20 years ago," he explains. "On the spur of the moment we bought a GWR mixed freight train set. We set it up in his garage and everything spiralled from there." Work on 'A Nod to Brent' started in 2003. Robin has continuously refined the layout over the years: "I don't think layouts are ever finished," he says. "I'm always adding, detailing and weathering new stock. That's the aspect of the hobby I enjoy the most."

Finally, thin layers of varnish were brushed onto the dried Realistic Water for a glossy finish.

GRASSROOTS TO GREATNESS

Robin chose a subject matter that really appealed, and he's stuck to his guns; 'A Nod to Brent' is testament to what can be achieved if you take your time and see a project through. It's hard to believe that 'A Nod to Brent' was Robin's first proper layout. Not only is it beautifully modelled, it clearly resembles the prototype.

Since embarking on 'A Nod to Brent' in 2003, Robin has become an experienced modeller. As such, he has some advice for anyone embarking on their first proper layout: "Plan everything, because I never did. The prototype has two overbridges, but I only managed to accommodate one on my layout. If I'd been more thorough in the planning stage I could have found room for two."

No layout is perfect and every layout is a learning experience. Find a subject that interests you, stick with it and you might end up surprising yourself. 'A Nod to Brent' gets a tip of the hat from *Model Rail*.

Masterplan Dramatic Lines

Trackplans to get you thinking in three dimensions



DOCKSIDE

If the thought of industrial locomotives scurrying around large ships floats your boat, let **Paul A. Lunn** whet your appetite with this modular, expandable concept, in **Part 2** of our Dramatic Lines series.

railway doesn't have to be surrounded by towering mountains to be dramatic. Sometimes, a man-made landscape can be just as impressive. So this 'dramatic line' focuses on a railway that was built through the urban jungle: the Manchester Ship Canal Railway.

Actually, the railway was instrumental in the construction of this particular urban jungle. The Manchester Ship Canal scheme was born in 1882. Shipping tariffs charged in Liverpool irked Manchester's traders and merchants and so, influenced by the success of the Suez Canal, work started on a canal to give the inland city access to the sea.

Construction started in 1887, and it was completed

in 1893. Unlike the canals normally associated with narrowboats and barges, the Manchester Ship Canal averaged a width of 120ft and was 27ft 10in deep; a typical, 'traditional' canal is, on average, 4ft deep.

The MSC is 36 miles long. It runs from Eastham Locks on the south bank of the River Mersey, opposite Liverpool, flanking the river via Runcorn to near Lymm, where the two merge for a few miles. The canal then uses the River Irwell to Manchester.

Railways were vital to the canal's construction, and the canal company took over the contractor's railways. This became the Manchester Ship Canal Railway, the largest private railway in the British Isles, with over 230 miles of track.

The Manchester Ship Canal helped form Trafford Park, the world's first industrial estate. The site, occupying approximately five square miles, was adjacent to the MSC and had its own wharf. It became a hive of activity, featuring steel foundries, oil works, brick manufacture, biscuits and lard production. It became the place for North American companies to set up UK operations: Ford opened its first factory outside of Detroit in Trafford Park in 1911, which would be replaced by a purpose-built plant in Dagenham, in 1931. Cereal giant Kellogg's European operations are based here.

Housing, churches, public baths and hotels soon appeared. Westinghouse became Trafford Park's largest employer, and it played a major part in British weapons and munition production.

Trafford Park has its own railway, which started life as a gas-operated tramway. In 1904, the Estates Company became the operating company of the Trafford Park Estate Railway, which was linked to the Manchester Ship Canal's metals.

The MSC and Trafford Park suffered during Britain's industrial move towards containerised traffic.

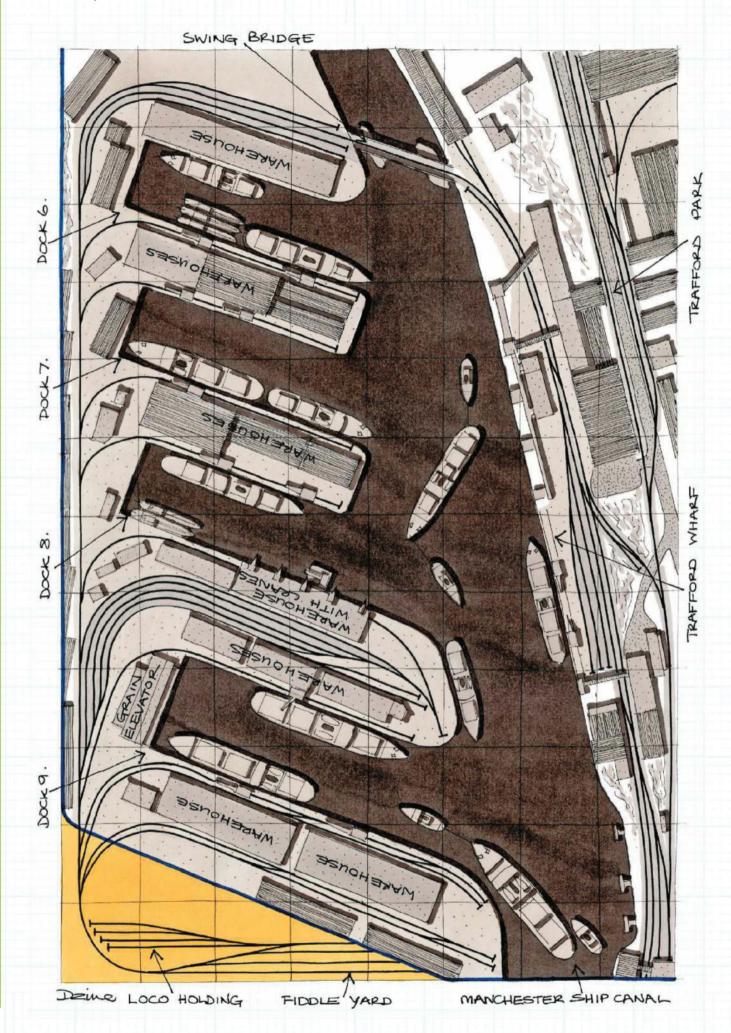

DESIGN CONCEPT

A modulai approach

This track plan is more of a schematic of the prototype, drawing on many real aspects of Manchester Docks, Salford, and to which I've added a number of fictitious components. It's a much-compressed yet plausible design, with key features as follows:

- Flexible sized 'N' gauge layout: maximum overall is 12ft by 8ft, minimum is 4ft by 2ft.
- Large layout built in small components, both 4ft by 2ft and 4ft by 4ft.
- The project could be built in stages over a number of years, and several sections can be used as stand-alone units.
- stand-alone units.
 Boards can be matched in pairs for exhibition use.
 There follows a selection of various layout sizes, contained within the much larger design, which can be arranged for exhibition. Please note: for those who prefer working in 'OO', plans 1 to 4 would easily double up for the larger scale without becoming unmanageable in size.

A Plan 1 represents the first phase, a 4ft by 2ft micro layout which comprises several sidings to shunt, one large warehouse, Dock No. 6 and a roughly triangular area of ground to the right, to be filled with raw

materials for export/import. The cassette and

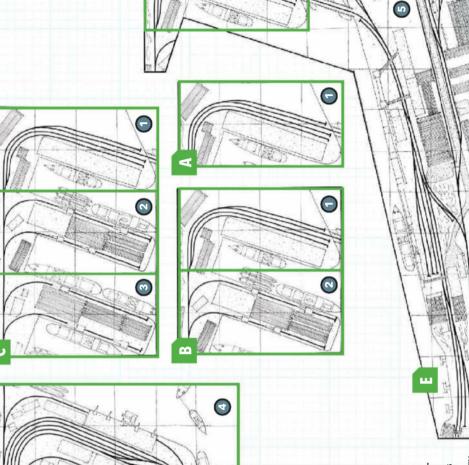
fiddleyard is top left.

B Plans 1 and 2 could be built with the latter as the first expansion to 1, or both built together as a single 4ft-square unit. Add a temporary cassette or fiddleyard top left.

C Plans 1 and 2 could be expanded by adding Plan 3 to make a 6ft by 4ft layout. Conversely, the whole thing could be built as one fixed layout from the outset. Add a cassette or fiddleyard top left.

D Plan 4 consists of the largest and most interesting docks and can be built either as a further add-on to plans 1-3, or as a stand-alone 6ft-square layout.

E Plan 5 brings in Trafford Wharf and Trafford Park as a 12ft by 8ft 'L'-shaped arrangement that could include one or more of the smaller docks. If viewed from the inside, I would suggest revising the track plan in order to give improved viewing access to

IISC WAGONS

I don't propose to focus on individual wagon types, save for mentioning that Bachmann, Graham Farish, Dapol and Peco offer a wide selection in either ready-to-run or kit form. What I do want to focus on is the difficulty of shunting in 'N' gauge.

There's a variety of magnetic uncoupling systems available, and while I'm sure many readers have personal preferences, I've been particularly impressed with Dapol's East-Shunt system. I can't emphasise enough the importance of extreme accuracy in fitting products - especially couplings - to wagons without a pocket, and those made by different manufacturers in your core stock. Furthermore, it's likely that all wagons will require additional weight to keep them on the track during the uncoupling process.

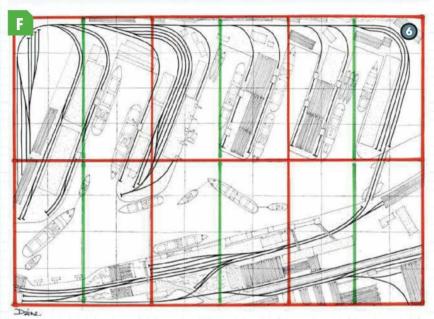

the Park lines and perhaps pulling everything slightly forward, so the single track section is not so close up against the backscene.

F Finally, as shown in Plan 6, the entire layout can be divided up into a series of matched boards, six at 4ft sq (shown in red) or 12 at 4ft by 2ft (green). Please note that the join lines for the former work better as far as structures are concerned, and that you may have to adjust some pointwork so as to avoid baseboard joints. Conversely, the design can be used as a home-based layout, retaining some sectional joints to give access for cleaning and maintenance.

Where layouts are built in incremental sections, rather than as stand-alone units, you'll have to deal with baseboard joints in the 'water', as follows:

- Make joints as unobtrusive as possible.
- Wherever possible, view-block with ships and boats, not in neat straight lines but at angles, or in front of joint lines from the normal viewing side.
- Set the layout at a height where the docks are at eye-level and, therefore, all joints are masked from view.



MSC'S LOCOMOTIVE FLEET

The Manchester Ship Canal owned 91 steam locomotives from the following builders: Hudswell Clarke (56), Hunslet (21), Kitson (seven), Peckett (four) and one each from Manning Wardle, Hudswell Clarke & Rogers, and Vulcan Foundry.

Between 1959 and 1966, it bought 34 diesels: D1 to D14 (204hp Hudswell Clarkes), DH15-DH32 (Rolls-Royce Sentinels) and two 400hp Hudswell Clarke

0-6-0DEs - 4001 and 4002.

Starting from SCATCH

The unique character of London Transport proved a fitting challenge for 3mm stalwart **Phill Hutchings**.

hose who build in 3mm:1ft scale uphold one of the last surviving areas of the hobby, where just about every aspect of layout construction involves an element of scratchbuilding. In a world of out-of-the-box track, stock, buildings and scenery, 3mm modelling requires a mastery of working with metals, plastic and card, which were once a prerequisite for every railway modeller.

Going 3mm is challenging enough, but Phill Hutchings decided to make life even harder for himself – he wanted to capture the intricacies and unique character of London Transport. This is not Phill's first layout to carry the name 'Addison Park'. His first was set in the 1930s and featured North London Railway steam services and Southern electrics running into a small terminus.

A new layout moved the setting into the early 1950s London Transport scene, with the first post-war trains running alongside vintage pre-war stock. Phill built new baseboards rather than be saddled with the odd-sized collection from the previous build. He also decided to ditch 12mm gauge 'TT' track in favour of the more accurate 14.2mm gauge. Yet another modelling challenge!

However, after a house move the layout was put in storage, and that's where it would have stayed had the editor of the 3mm Society's magazine *Mixed Traffic* not appealed for layout features.

Phill submitted a photograph of one of his scratchbuilt Metropolitan Railway electrics and a rake of Worsley Works 'Dreadnought' coaches on a section of the embryonic layout. It generated a lot of interest and people wanted to know more, so Phill had to get to work.

FOURTH RAIL

London Underground trackwork is always a challenge, whatever scale you work in. Modelling a third rail system is bad enough, but London Underground uses the fourth rail system, where the rail outside the running rails is the positive (+420V DC) and the inner rail is the negative (-210V DC).

Phill used 3mm Society 14.2mm track with Code 60 rail for the running lines and glued Code 70 flat bottom rail for the conductor rails to the sleepers. The reason for the deeper rail on the conductor rails is that the outer rail stands 3in above the running rails,

All the buildings are scratchbuilt, using multiple layers of card.



Extra attention was given to the site of the abandoned trackwork in the foreground to reflect its return to nature, and semi-relief trees were added to the backscene, a far more realistic solution than painted trees!



Phill used a variety of hues and a mix of scrub and grass, so typical of these areas, to avoid making the landscape appear uniform and sterile.

What makes this layout great?



'Addison Park' is different - not only is it 3mm, but it's a representation of London Transport, a subject matter we seldom get to experience in any scale. And despite the wonderful RTR models that so many of us hold dear, there's no denying that scratchbuilding is model making in its purest form.

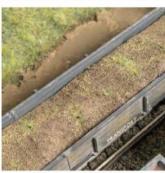

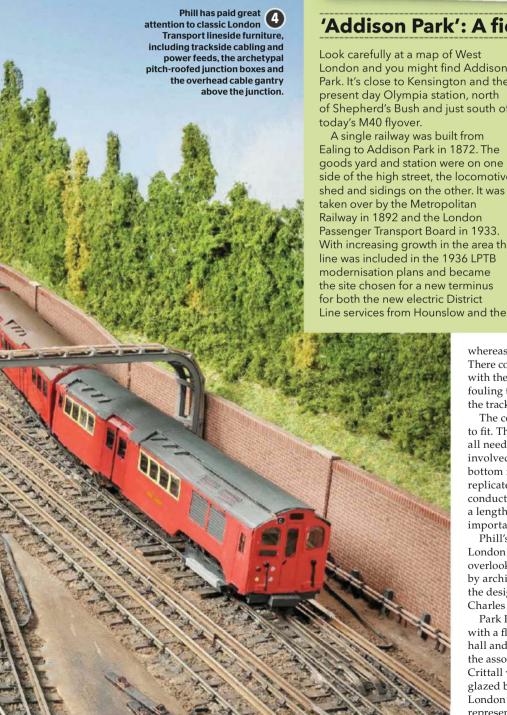














'Addison Park': A fictional history

Look carefully at a map of West London and you might find Addison Park. It's close to Kensington and the present day Olympia station, north of Shepherd's Bush and just south of

A single railway was built from Ealing to Addison Park in 1872. The goods yard and station were on one side of the high street, the locomotive shed and sidings on the other. It was taken over by the Metropolitan Railway in 1892 and the London Passenger Transport Board in 1933. With increasing growth in the area the line was included in the 1936 LPTB modernisation plans and became the site chosen for a new terminus for both the new electric District

Piccadilly Line from South Harrow.

This new terminus represented a collaborative project between LPTB and local developers, with an imaginative Charles Holden-inspired station building incorporating shops, offices and a large housing estate alongside, mirroring a similar project at Park Royal, which sits alongside the A40 Western Avenue in north Ealing.

A short section of track that led to the original station under the road was retained for goods traffic into a small yard, but this closed after the Second World War and the track lifted. However, the former trackbed, underbridge and some associated infrastructure survive... if, of course, any of the above was true.

whereas the inner rail stands just 1½in proud. There could have been an issue with the clearances, with the motor bogies and their 9mm wheels fouling the insulators. The 9mm wheels only just clear the trackwork!

The conductor rails were the most demanding to fit. There were lots of very short sections and all needed a ramp at each end. Phill's technique involved filing down the head of a piece of flat bottom rail and twisting the flat section down to replicate a ramp. This would be attached to the conductor rail that was already in place. It was a lengthy process but it really captures this important detail.

Phill's station building is based on the stylish London Transport building at Park Royal that overlooks the A40 Western Avenue. It was created by architect Felix Lander in the 1930s, working to the designs of the legendary station designer Charles Holden.

Park Royal is a truly impressive building of its era, with a flat concrete roof, brick tower, circular booking hall and a sweeping curved block accommodating the associated shops and flats. The long runs of Crittall windows, central tower and dramatic curved glazed booking hall made a strong statement about London Transport's ambitions in the late 1930s, and represented exactly the building Phill needed for his redeveloped station.

Stock

Perhaps the most impressive aspect of Phill's layout is the rolling stock, a mixture of 1950s sub-surface and tube stock. Everything is scratch-built from card, plastic and Perspex with metal detail, and they're all powered by Halling motor bogies. Phill's fleet list comprises:

'F' Stock: Built for District Railway by

Metropolitan Cammell, transferred to Metropolitan Railway in 1950/51. In service: 1920-1963. One set in LT red. 'O'/'P'/'Q' Stock: A standardised sub-surface design built by Gloucester and BRCW. 'O' stock worked the Hammersmith & City, 'P' worked the Metropolitan and 'Q' stock was for the District. In service: 1937-1981. All models in red livery.

'R' Stock: 1949-built version of 'O'/'P'/'Q' Stock, utilising some rebuilt 'Q' Stock driving motor cars. In service: 1949-1983. One set in silver with maroon lining.

'T' Stock: All new motor cars worked initially with older trailer cars, but later builds also received all new trailer cars. Built by Metropolitan Vickers and BRCW. In service: 1927-1962. Two sets, one in later brown and the other in brown but including two prototype A60 vehicles in red livery

'Dreadnought' coaches: The first were rebuilds that entered service in 1910, followed by two more batches built in 1912 and 1920,



respectively. Later builds included pick-up shoes for electric heating and lighting. In service: 1910-1962. Standard Stock: The first standardised EMU used on the deep Tube lines. In service: 1923-1966, although some vehicles found use on departmental duties or were shipped to the Isle of Wight. One set in red livery with cream trim. 1938 Stock: The classic Tube train, which formed the basis for all subsequent designs until the 1990s. Over 1,000 cars were built by Metro-Cammell and BRCW. In service: 1938-1988, although some still in service on the Isle of Wight as Class 483. Metropolitan electric locomotives: Twenty of these machines were introduced in 1921, and although classified rebuilds, they were largely new, being built by Metropolitan Vickers. In service: 1921-1962. Three locomotives: Nos. 8 Sherlock Holmes, and 9 in wartime grey and 16 Oliver Goldsmith in maroon. Battery locomotives: Six locomotives built to the Tube loading gauge were ordered from Gloucester Railway Carriage & Wagon Co. in 1936 to replace older machines. Two locomotives, Nos. 35 and 38, in maroon livery. ACV unit: An experimental, modular multiple unit built by Associated Commercial Vehicle Co. (AEC and Park Royal) in 1952. It was used on the Chesham branch in October 1952.

On the buses

Phill's bus garage is another feature that captures the essence of 1950s London Transport. The building, based on the office and canteen building at Leatherhead, plays host to some significant vehicles:

Pioneer Routemaster RM1 is on its tour of LT bus depots as the 'bus of the future' and is being inspected by local drivers and conductors. Alongside, is one of the new AEC Regal IV RFW touring coaches in green and cream livery, with a standard red RF behind. And to complete the line-up at the garage is a Regal IV British European Airways coach in its attractive blue and grey finish. Phill scratchbuilt the latter, built his RFs from Brynkits products and RM1 is a modified Lesney Matchbox model.



Not content with simply modelling an archetypal LT station, Phill was determined to capture the street scenes that were so typical of London in the 1950s when the city was beginning to free itself from the immediate post-war period but still displayed features from that dark time. Harold Macmillan's assertion that we had 'never had it so good' was just around the corner and the impact of the Swinging '60s was still some way in the future!

Phill has created a very convincing high street scene immediately outside the station entrance with many buildings mirroring actual examples, such as the Westminster Bank property, based on the building in Thame in Oxfordshire but quite appropriate for this location. This area creates as much interest on the exhibition circuit as the railway itself and includes a number of rarely modelled features that reflect both Phill's attention to detail and his observation skills.

Two scratchbuilt C Class LT trolleybuses are plying their trade, and one is modelled with its poles down after developing a fault. The driver is shown positioning the bamboo pole up against the back of the bus to let other drivers know that it is safe to pass by on the wires.

Austin FX3 taxis complete the scene, and one is portrayed about to practise its extremely tight turning ability as it swings round to the station >

entrance for its next fare. The reflective pads that line the pedestrian crossing are left over from war when they acted as an aid during the Blitz blackouts. The convincing nature of the scene is enhanced by some intricate scratchbuilt trolley pole and wire modelling.

Phill has always enjoyed modelling unusual or slightly different aspects of railways in either 4mm or 3mm and this, his latest in a series of outstanding 3mm

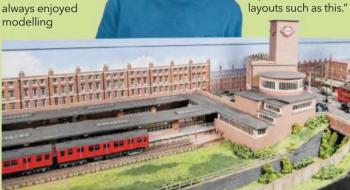
layouts, demonstrates his command of this scale and his attention to detail. Exceptional observation skills are reflected in the evocative street scenes and iconic road vehicles, as well as the intricate trackwork and stunning rolling stock. 'Addison Park' is a modelling masterpiece and a triumph for scratchbuilding. But then, as he will tell you, he has actually been working in 3mm for over 40 years!

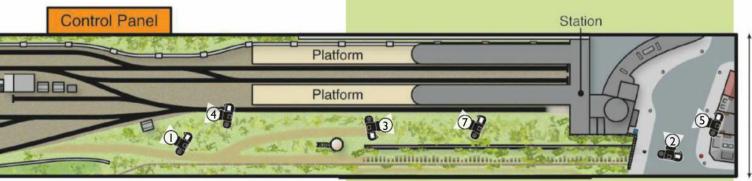

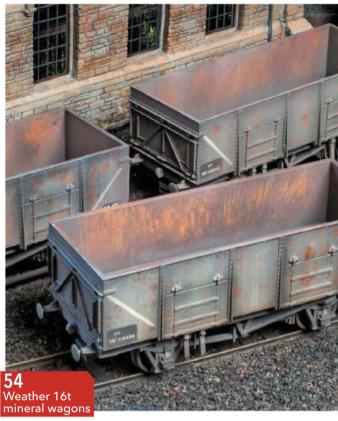

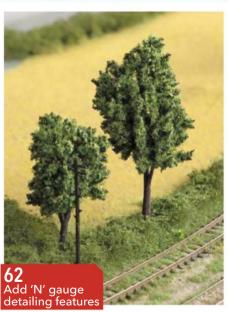

Fuelled by nostalgia (and, perhaps, feeling the cold snap) **George Dent** recreates one of the early electric train heating-equipped Class 31/4s.

ush home from school. Get changed. Scoff a couple of biscuits. Grab boots, gloves and a football. Sprint over to the playing field. Stand in goal as the whistle blows.

Then listen out for the sound of a '31'. Luckily, the football pitch bordered the railway and, at five-to and five-past every hour, a Class 31/4-hauled trans-Pennine service would rumble past. If I was at the right end of the pitch, I'd sneakily remove

right end of the pitch, I'd sneakily remove the pen from my sock and scribble the numbers on the back of my gloves - the perks of being a 'goalie'!

Introduced in the mid-1980s, these secondary expresses provided welcome relief on the otherwise DMU-only Cheshire Lines route between Liverpool and Manchester. Alas, the excitement was relatively short-lived, with new 'Super Sprinter' units taking over in the early 1990s.

My old 'Abc' from 1989 shows well over three quarters of the 69 Class 31/4s underlined, which is not bad considering that these trains had only been running for a couple of years.

The '31/4s' had been converted originally in the 1970s, as more electrically heated,

air-braked passenger stock entered traffic. While the '31s' were never blessed with high speed or hauling power, they were useful locomotives nonetheless. The '31/4s' were initially employed on empty coaching stock duties in the London area, before redeployment on secondary services further afield.

Indeed, the class became synonymous with a number of services and routes in the 1980s and early '90s, including the Leeds-Settle-Carlisle, Hull/Leeds-Lancaster, Cardiff-Portsmouth, North Wales coast and trans-Pennine services via the Hope Valley and Diggle routes.

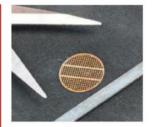
With a few 'OO' Class 31s already in my collection, I'd yet to replicate one of the 31/4 fleet. So, after picking up a reasonably priced pre-owned Hornby model, I set to.

It's been pleasant to recall those youthful memories while working on this project. The '31s' may not have captured many enthusiasts' imaginations during their heyday, but I always loved the sight and sound of them rushing through Sankey station with four Mk 2s in tow.

Mind you, when I wonder why I never made it as a footballer, perhaps I should've concentrated more on the ball instead of those shabby blue diesels...



Rolling, rolling, rolling...



Shaping etched metal parts is simple. All you need is a computer mouse mat and a steel rod. Cut the part from the fret and tidy up the edges with a needle file.



Lay the part face-down onto the back of the mouse mat and gently roll the steel rod across the surface. Start with the rod in the centre of the part and move back and forth.



Only gentle pressure is required. Check the profile regularly. If it needs a tighter curvature, apply more pressure with the rod.

Prototype factfile: 31418

Built at the famous Brush Works in Loughborough, D5522 entered traffic in March 1959, at Stratford depot, along with the previous 22 Brush Type 2s. It was allocated the TOPS number of 31104 but this was never carried, as D5522 was selected for Electric Train Heating (ETH) conversion in 1973.

Gaining the new identity of 31418, this was the first locomotive of the original headcode disc - or 'skinhead' - pattern to be converted. Eventually, 69 locomotives were converted to '31/4' status by the late 1980s, with just three more 'skinheads' treated (31444/450/461).

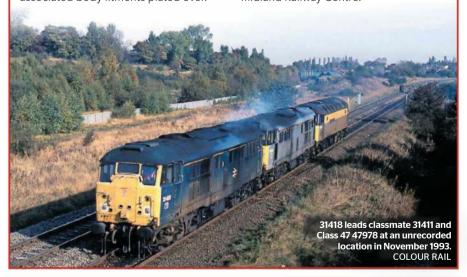
Initially, 31418 retained its steam generator after ETH conversion, along with the disc headcodes and original fittings, such as bufferbeam cowlings and a raised waist-level panel. Following a heavy general overhaul in the late 1980s, the boiler was removed and all associated body fitments plated over.

The elegant cowlings and waist strip were also cut away.

High-intensity headlights were installed around the turn of the 1990s, along with rooftop aerial pods. By this time, 31418's use on passenger stock was dwindling, with parcels, freight and civil engineers' workings being more common.

Becoming something of a celebrity in the North West and Midlands, the shabby blue locomotive received the unofficial name of 'Boadicea', applied in white italics on the bodysides, along with painted-on white disc headcodes at the No. 1 end.

As British Rail fragmented, 31418 was briefly taken into Transrail's traction fleet, before withdrawal in October 1995. Happily, preservation beckoned under the care of A1A Locomotives. Currently, '418' is undergoing restoration at the Midland Railway Centre.



Buyer beware - 'Mazak Rot'

Be careful when buying a second-hand Hornby '31'. Avoid any of the earliest batches that featured inferior alloy chassis that have since expanded and fractured, leading to burst plastic bodyshells. I've discovered that two of my models have this affliction and I have yet to try and salvage them – another project for the future!



If, like me, you intend to strip the donor model back to bare plastic, the bodyshell requires dismantling. Remove all glazing, cab interiors and lighting circuits and store all parts and screws in a safe place.



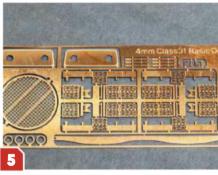
Phoenix Paints' Superstrip is extremely effective on plastic models. Decant into a sealable container and soak the body for up to ten hours. Scrub with an old toothbrush before washing and rinsing thoroughly.



Carefully cut away any unwanted detail to suit your prototype. For 31418, I needed to slice away the lamp brackets, remove the handrails and fill the headcode disc mounting holes.



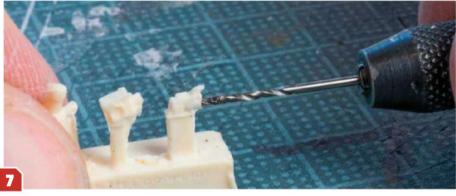
Revised pattern handrails were formed from 0.3mm stiff brass wire, shaped with roundnose pliers. Mark and drill mounting holes and secure the wire in place. Plastic headlights (from Replica) were glued in position.



The PH Design detail kit includes many parts to suit a variety of prototypes throughout their long careers and is designed to fit either the Lima model (now in the Hornby RailRoad range) or the 'high-spec' Hornby version.



The fine etched lamp brackets from the PH Design kit were carefully folded to shape and secured with cyano adhesive. A few extra blobs of glue to the fold joints help the brackets keep their shape.



PH Design also offers a set of resin ETH sockets. Clean up any flash with a sharp scalpel and drill a hole in the base of the main cab-mounted socket to accept a length of copper wire (see Step 20).



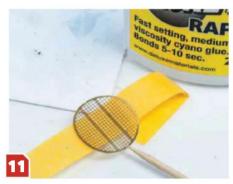
Cut the resin sockets from the casting base carefully and tidy the rear with a flat file before fixing to the lower edge of the cab front. Check prototype images for exact locations.



While the PH Design kit provides a radiator grille, a Shawplan set also comes in handy. I decided to blend the two sets together, not least as I have a terrible habit of breaking the ultra-fine Shawplan mesh!



Having removed the original grille, the Shawplan base plug is shaped to the correct profile (see panel) and glued in place. Fill any gaps around the edge and sand gently to blend with the surrounding roof.



Cut the etched grille from the PH Design fret and dress the edges smooth with a needle file. After rolling to shape, lay it face-down on a strip of low-tack masking tape. Apply a thin bead of cyano glue around the edge.



Align the grille carefully before laying it in place, using the tape to clamp it securely while the glue cures. Wait for an hour or so before gently peeling the tape away. File or sand away any dried glue deposits.



Repeat the process with the Shawplan retaining ring. Cyano glue demands rapid progress, so less experienced modellers may prefer epoxy adhesive, which gives longer working times.



Finally, the PH
Design cowling
strip was rolled
to a form a circle.
The ends overlap
slightly and were

Build up the numbered layers of the Shawplan fan on the end of a cocktail stick. Bond with glue or solder. When dry, cut and drill away the wood before mounting onto the shaft on the Hornby chassis.



The final detail to add to the body is a pair of rooftop aerial pods (if your prototype demands them). Mark out the roof's centreline to ensure correct alignment. Etched parts are available from Shawplan or A1 Models.



The PH Design footsteps are best assembled with solder, the delicate parts building into fairly robust little units that are far superior to the moulded originals. Follow the instructions carefully.



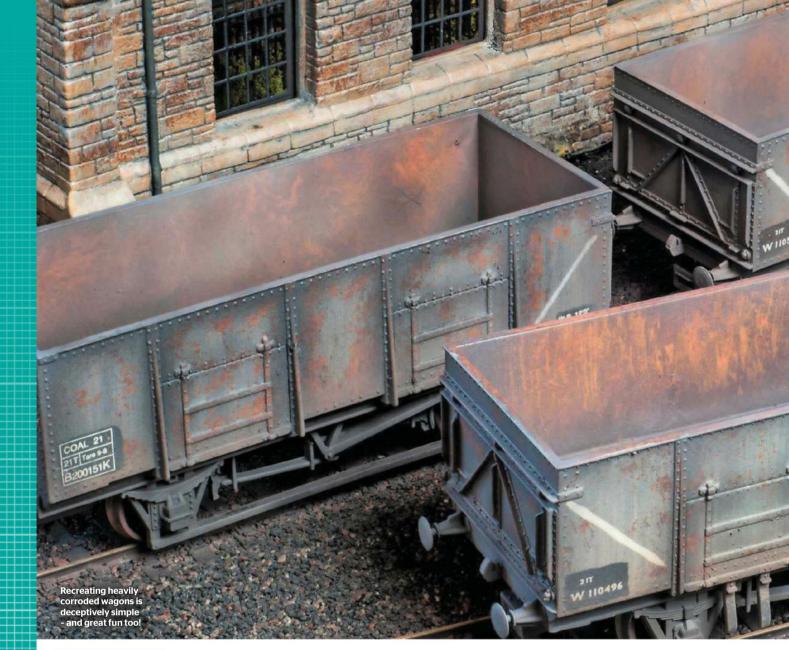
Pull away the moulded steps with pliers and fix the etched units into position, securing with cyano or epoxy glue. The 'V'-shaped recess should sit snugly atop the cylinder moulded onto the bogie frame.



After priming and painting the bodyshell, a deep gloss clear finish was applied prior to the application of waterslide decals. An orange cantrail stripe was then added using paint and a ruling pen.



After final re-assembly, the ETH jumper cables were created from copper wire fixed into the bufferbeam-mounted receptacle. The wire then slots loosely into the cab-mounted sockets to allow for easy dismantling in future.



HOW TO

CREATE RUST -WITHOUT A FUSS

Creating authentic corrosion effects on steel wagons can be a challenge. Luckily, George Dent knows an effective shortcut!

dread to think how many steel-bodied mineral wagons are lurking in my rolling stock collection. These onceubiquitous vehicles came in many different shapes and sizes, so there's little risk of running out of inspiration.

As coal was once the most important commodity to be transported by rail, pre-Thatcher-era modellers really can't have too many of them!

They also offer endless possibilities in terms of weathering. Indeed, they provide the perfect blank canvas for all manner of techniques and processes. With many cheap

RTR or kit options to be found, we can practise these methods to our hearts' content, free from the worry associated with working on expensive models.

Dapol's range of unpainted 'OO' gauge wagons is especially suited to experimentation with weathering techniques. The underframes are also ripe for replacement with superior plastic or metal kits and components, but here we'll concentrate on making

the best of what's provided in the box.

With the 21t mineral wagon, the moulded plastic bodies feature plenty of detail relief that can be greatly enhanced with a considered weathering job alone.

Such wagons received plenty of abuse during their working lives, and contemporary images show large areas of peeling paint revealing patches of corroded steelwork. What's important to note is that the rust

appears from beneath the paintwork, rather than atop the finish.

This vital aspect is not so difficult to recreate in miniature, as many people assume. Indeed, there are numerous possible methods and materials to achieve this end, including the use of salt crystals, Marmite and hairspray. However, using ordinary masking fluid - such as Humbrol's Maskol - provides one of the simplest and cleanest methods.

Equally suitable for any scale, the addition of a discernible texture to the 'rust' is another key element in the process. This is

often omitted by modellers, yet it has a transformative effect on perfectly flat, plastic or metal surfaces and mirrors reality; run your fingers over an area of corroded steel and you'll feel a very rough, uneven

I'm a long way from shaking my addiction to weathering mineral wagons. Indeed, I'm still having great fun refining and tweaking my favoured techniques, with the aim of constantly improving the finished results.

The way things are going, though, I may have to model Edge Hill's 'grid iron' sidings in order to accommodate them all!

Dapol's unpainted wagons offer the perfect basis for low-risk weathering practice. Simply unclip the body from the chassis and treat it to a coat of grey aerosol primer.



Mix up a range of 'rust' shades (see previous page), plus a darker tone, such as Weathered Black, on a palette. Add a little rust-coloured dry pigment to create a slightly gritty texture.



Brush the textured paint over the whole bodyshell, including the interior of open wagons. A flat brush is best, employing a dabbing, stippling action to maximize surface texture.



When dry, stipple further shades (without the dry pigment added) onto the surface, dabbing most of the paint onto some tissue beforehand, to create a variety of subtle light and dark rust tones.



With the 'corroded' finish completely dry, apply masking fluid by dabbing with a scrap of natural sponge. Leave the fluid to dry for at least 30 minutes before continuing.



The livery can be sprayed or applied by hand, with a flat, soft-bristled brush. Introduce tonal variety by adding lighter and darker shades to the livery colour, mixing the wet paints on the model's surface.



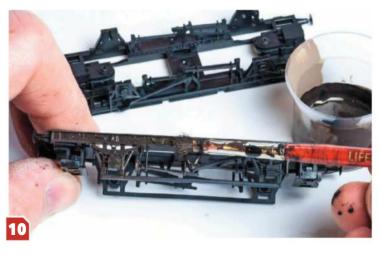
When dry, employ a stiff, dry brush in vertical strokes to loosen and remove the masking film, revealing the corrosion beneath. Note how the different livery shades give the paintwork a lived-in aspect.



Apply clear gloss coats to the entire bodyshell, prior to adding waterslide decals. Once dry, seal with a flat matt clear coat. Try adding the white stripes with a fine brush and light grey paint.



To treat the underframe, mix a further palette of paints and dry pigments, this time using darker shades of paint and dry pigment. Tailor the degree of grittiness by altering the amount of dry pigment added.



Having removed the wheels, stipple the textured medium onto the underframe, working it into all of the raised and recessed detail. Be sure to keep it clear of the axle bearings.



Treat the wheels separately with the same textured paint mix, employing a wooden peg to hold them securely. Work the paint into the spokes to achieve an even coating.



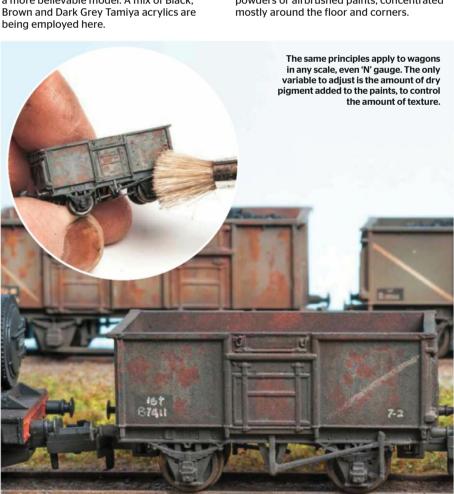
Clean the wheel treads and pinpoint axles with a swab dipped in a track cleaning fluid, such as Track Magic. Avoid white spirit as it may leave an oily residue behind.



Final weathering, with dry pigments or an airbrush, softens any hard edges and creates a more believable model. A mix of Black, Brown and Dark Grey Tamiya acrylics are being employed here.

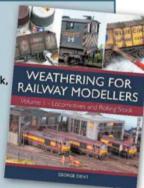


Interiors can be left in the all-over corroded finish, duly weathered with a darker mix of powders or airbrushed paints, concentrated mostly around the floor and corners.

HOW TO

CREATE A Mk 4 BARRIER VEHICLE

George Dent proves that age is no barrier when it comes to breathing new life into an old Lima Mk 2 carriage, by converting it into a Mk 4 barrier vehicle.

ith their sunken glazing, chunky moulded detail, huge wheel flanges and obtrusive couplings, it's no surprise that many of us have disposed of our RTR coaches from yesteryear.

However, there are still potential uses for models dating back to the 1980s - and earlier. Indeed, I regret trading in my old Lima, Airfix and Replica stock, as there are numerous Departmental prototypes that can be readily reproduced using these cheap, basic models.

Furthermore, Departmental conversions resolve many of the shortcomings of older stock: poor glazing and basic levels of detail become irrelevant when the windows are plated over and fittings removed. Upgrading wheels and couplings is simple enough, providing a dramatic uplift in looks and performance.

There are certainly plenty of prototypes to choose from, for steam and diesel-era modellers. Barrier or translator vehicles,

works test trains, mess or tool vans and camping coaches are all possibilities.

The degree of accuracy is down to personal aspiration and available reference material. A modicum of compromise may be necessary, depending on the models you have at hand. To illustrate the possibilities, I've unearthed an old Lima Mk 2, with the aim of converting it into a barrier vehicle for Mk 4 stock.

IC225 BARRIERS

When BR's flagship Mk 4 stock emerged, a fleet of barrier vehicles was also required, to allow individual coaches to be moved by locomotives with traditional draw gear. A total of six redundant carriages (four Mk 2As and two Mk 2Cs) were duly converted into barrier cars, with knuckle couplings installed at (and buffers removed from) one end.

Alas, my Lima Mk 2B coach is not an ideal donor model. While it's easy to correct the pattern of doors to portray a Mk 2A, the fact that it's a Second Class carriage is the main problem. Real barriers were either First Class Corridor or Standard Brake Opens, so the number and spacing of the windows is not correct for either.

Accuracy issues aside, I'm more than happy with the finished result - it provides an interesting addition to my early privatisation-era stock. An unloved model that would otherwise have ended up in the scrap line or sold for peanuts has been given a new lease of life at minimal cost.

It certainly looks at home with more modern RTR stock. In fact, my Hornby Mk 4s now look in dire need of a detail upgrade themselves!

Mk 1s were also a popular source of Departmental vehicles, being employed in test trains or as barrier vehicles for HST or EMU stock. CHRIS GILSON/RA/I.



The first job is to remove all raised detail from the carriage sides with a flat file and abrasive pads. I chose to leave the roof and glazing in place (it's a single moulding) to help support the plastic sides.



Work through various abrasive grades until the sides are super-smooth. More accurate door seams were added with a profile cutting tool (Tamiya), drawn along a set square with light pressure.

Clamp a straightedge to the sides to help align the blanking plates, securing from within with liquid poly cement. Apply the solvent sparingly to achieve neat bonds and to avoid seepage onto the exterior.



Door hinges, cut from 10thou' square plastic strip, were fixed into the recessed door seams with extra-thin liquid poly cement, applied with a small brush. Mark out their locations with a pencil beforehand.



The gangway at one end was removed and the surface flattened before blanking over with more 10thou' plastic card. All other detail was removed from this end, including the buffers.



A horizontal recess was formed across the non-gangway end with a flat needle file, before creating a smoother surface with abrasive pads. Any gaps or flaws were treated with filler and sanded smooth.



At the other end, the moulded handrails were gently cut away with a sharp scalpel. Mounting holes were drilled and new handrails formed from fine brass wire. The buffers were also replaced with products from MJT castings.



The roof and glazing is formed from a brittle clear plastic and must be handled carefully. The roof was sanded smooth before drilling mounting holes for new ventilators.

Wheels can shift on their axles during handling, so always check that they're correctly spaced with a back-to-back gauge.



Some of the underframe fittings were cut away with a razor saw and files. I had difficulty in establishing exactly how the underframes should be modified on each vehicle, so a little guesswork was involved.



I found some moulded air brake equipment in the spares box, from a Bachmann Mk 1 or Mk 2, and this brought some welcome realism to the sparse underframe. Extra plumbing could be installed using brass wire, if desired.



With the modification work complete, the roof/glazing unit and underframe were secured permanently to the bodyshell. Rubber bands clamped everything tightly while the glue set.



A coat of grey primer will highlight any surface imperfections that are hitherto invisible. These can be treated with filler and abrasives before cleaning and re-priming.



After a few coats of RailMatch GNER blue, followed by a high-gloss clear varnish, waterslide decals (Fox) provide the red stripes and detail embellishments. The stripes require a white base layer to be applied first.



I wasn't keen on the Lima bogies. A set of Bachmann B4 bogies (available separately) offer a much better alternative, especially when fitted with upgraded wheels with a finer flange profile.



After cutting away the small stabilising plastic stubs on the carriage floor, the Bachmann B4 bogies were attached with a pair of pan-head bolts screwed into the existing pivot holes.



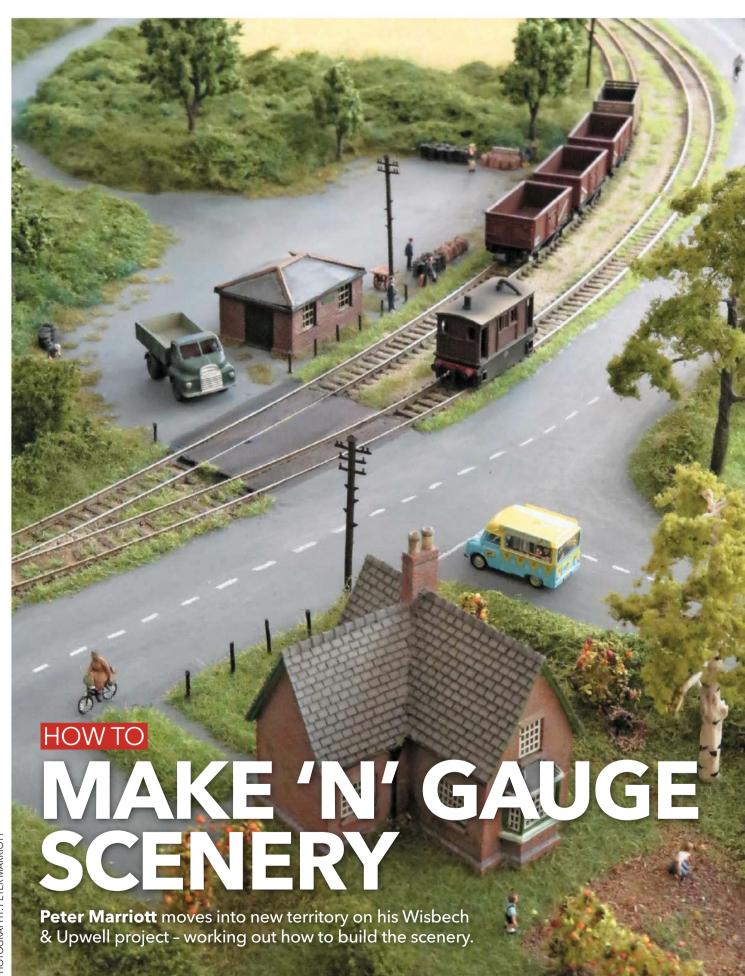
Symoba close-coupling units are secured to the centreline of the underframe. The existing cut-out of the Bachmann bogies provide clearance for use on shallow curves.

Modification may be needed for tighter curves.



Slot the NEM pocket onto the coupling pivot and use the Symoba jig to set the correct height. Glue the pocket in place, trim away the surplus material and affix your chosen coupler.

here really is practically no scenic accessory that you can't buy for a 'OO' gauge layout. Contrary to popular belief in the *Model Rail* office, I don't know about every single 'OO' gauge scenic accessory available, but I do have a fairly comprehensive knowledge of what's out there.

It's a slightly different situation in 'N'.

However, the amount of available accessories is catching up with the larger gauge. With the greater amount of scenic space to play with in 'N', to my mind the scenic possibilities are arguably better.

The scenic skills required on 'N' gauge layouts are somewhat different to those on 'OO' and larger. Take static grass, for

example. This didn't have a place on 'N' gauge layouts until manufacturers started to produce shorter fibres that were more suitable.

What follows is how I modelled the scenery on my Wisbech & Upwell layouts. And because this part of the world is flat, there won't be any references to hills made from plaster-impregnated cloth!

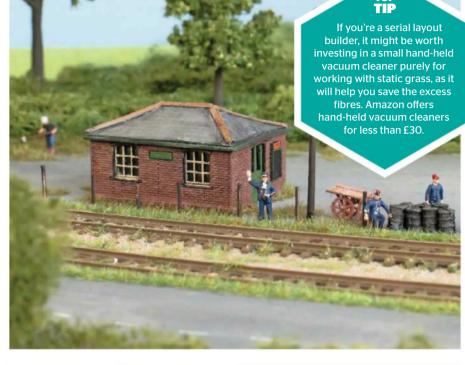


Grass

An increasing number of manufacturers make static grass for 'N' gauge. Ideally, you'll need fibres that are between 1mm and 2.5mm but, unlike the larger scales, one application will generally suffice.

The one difference between planting the shortest grass fibres and the longer ones is that you need to be very careful of the size of the holes in the sieve on your electrostatic grass planting tool. If the holes are too wide, the grass fibres will just drop through, even before the machine is turned on.

For tiny applications of grass fibres, the Pro Grass Precision Applicator from WWS is specifically designed for planting electrostatic grass in tight spaces and for adding the finishing touches to a layout. The Pro Grass Precision Applicator runs on a 9V battery supplying 15kV DC power to apply charge to the grass. The device is supplied with a small pot of glue, plus two sample bags of short green grass.

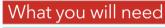




There is a good selection of short static grass fibres now available for 'N'. Choose fibres from Noch and WW Scenics that are 2.5mm or shorter in length.



Static grass applicators come with different heads to suit different length fibres. Select the head with the mesh best suited to 2.5mm or shorter fibres. Then fill the applicator with fibres.

- Paintbrush
- PVA glue



To plant the grass and weeds between the line and the road, I painted on Grass Glue with a round paintbrush.



Attach the alligator clip from the electrostatic grass planting tool to a rail (or a pin in the baseboard) to complete the electrical circuit.



Hold the electrostatic grass tool a few centimetres from the wet glue and shake it. The fibres will fall out and stand upright in the glue.



The glue dries clear. This is what the grass alongside the track looked like after a first pass. I added a second layer in some places later.



To represent the weeds between the lines, I dabbed just a little glue with a brush on to the tops of the sleepers, and around them.



I then filled a Gaugemaster Puffer Bottle with a blend of fibres. Hold your finger over the top and give the bottle a vigorous shake to 'charge' the fibres.



Squeeze the fibres out on to the white glue. How thick you want your grass to grow will depend on how much glue you apply - more glue equals more fibres.



In some places along the road I wanted to plant taller, yellow grass that you see during summer. Apply glue to the fibres already in place with a paint brush...



...I used Noch golden yellow 2.5mm static grass fibres to represent tall dead grass. I used a Noch Gras-Master 2.0, attaching its alligator clip to a rail to complete the electrical circuit.



I also wanted to plant some shorter weeds around the road and around the goods yard. I used the new Noch 2.5mm grass fibres with subtle colours.



Apply a thin layer of grass glue with a brush. Apply the glue with a stippling motion, rather than brushing it over the surface.



I used the Gras-Master 2.0 again to create these 'randomised' clumps. You can you see that there was a very thin gap under the base of the building. It had to go...



The first step was to paint a very thin line of PVA glue around the base of the building with one of the thinnest paintbrushes I could find.



I then used the WW Scenics Precision Pro Grass electrostatic tool to plant the 2mm grass fibres in the glue. I fixed the alligator clip to the adjacent rail.

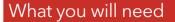


After the glue had dried, I removed the excess and this was the result. Hiding the gap between building and ground was worth the effort.

Hedges and foliage

Woodland Scenics Poly Fiber is a key product here. It's so versatile - you can tease it out between your fingers to make hedges, or you can roll it into balls and cover it in scatter to make background trees. And you can stick scatter to it with either PVA or extra-hold hairspray.

It's great value too: a bag of it will set you back just £3.50, and you'll have enough for a layout of this size. Oh, and you can use it for filling in gaps in the scenery and to model creeping plants on building walls.



TOOLS NEEDED

- Wide paintbrush
- Extra-hold hairspray
- PVA glue



10 mins per 20sq/cm of dense foliage; 30 min per 30cm hedge

Poly Fiber comes out of the bag in small 'balls'. Work it between your fingers so that it will cover a greater area.



Using a flat paintbrush, apply neat PVA glue to the area where you intend to plant your hedge. Spread it around with the brush to ensure even coverage.

Push the Poly Fiber into the glue with your finger. Don't worry about clearing up the excess glue just yet...



Sprinkle on fine, good-quality scatter material of your choice and leave it to dry. No wet glue should be showing.



Leave your hedge to dry. Vacuum away the excess scatter and you should be left with a hedge that looks something like this.



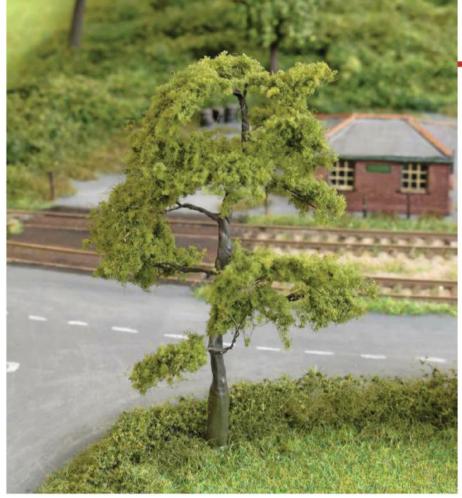
This section represents a heavily overgrown area, thick with weeds and brambles. The brighter green material is a fibre from US company Micromark (www.micromark.com).



Spray the area with extra-hold unscented hairspray. Supermarket own-brand hairspray is an economical purchase.



After sprinkling the green scatter materials on the still-wet hairspray, this is the result - quite a difference. This was just five minutes' work.

This is fruit growing territory, so I thought these Noch fruit trees would be ideal. The fruit looks horribly over-scale under a magnifying glass.



I ran a bead of PVA glue in the cottage garden and pushed the line of fruit trees into the glue. I spread the glue over the base and sprinkled on some 'soil' scatter.



Noch' 'N' gauge standard summer trees next to a 2p coin. The trees in the pack vary between 40mm and 100mm in height.



Drill, bore or punch a small hole into the baseboard, place a blob of PVA into the hole and press the tree in place. Hide the base with scatter. In this case, I've used Poly Fiber.

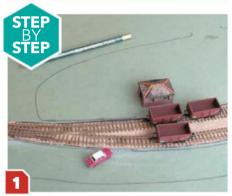


Roads

Roads often play a secondary, scenic role on layouts, but given the fact that the Wisbech & Upwell was a tramway, my road has a much more prominent part to play. Initially, I painted the road with grey acrylic, but it created a nasty rough finish when it dried.

My usual road making technique is to mix Woodland Scenics Asphalt and White Earth paint, which dries to a lovely flat, matt and road-like finish. While I was building the layout, I took delivery of a pack of Noch road marking templates featuring different markings, and I used them here.





I covered the entire baseboard with mounting card, after laying the track to build up the level of the land around the track. Here is where the road will go.



I reverted to my preferred road-making method: mix some Woodland Scenics Asphalt and white Earth Colours in a plastic dessert tub. Mix thoroughly – you don't want a streaky road.



To hide the joins in the two pieces of mounting card, I filled the gap with Deluxe Materials' Perfect Plastic Putty and left it to dry before prepping and painting.

I used grey acrylic from a hobby store to paint the road - but the brush marks dried like this. A road with pronounced grooves on it is not very realistic.



Here are the finished road and goods yard. I don't use the Asphalt neat as it's a bit too dark, which is why I mixed it with white.



Noch's road marking kit contains a template, bendable ruler and white marking pencil. The ruler ensures consistency of the road markings.

I thought that Tamiya's Finishing Abrasives would make light work of this, and they were ideal for removing the grooves in the road – but it took a lot of rubbing down!



I find that once the paint is dry, a light rub with some very fine Tamiya Finishing Abrasives removes any imperfections and tones down the surface for a neat finish.

CUSTOMISE A 'BUBBLECAR'

No matter how good a new model is, there's always something you can do to improve it. Railcar enthusiast **Chris Leigh** considers what he can do to make a Dapol Class 122 'bubblecar' his own.

was over the moon with Dapol's Gloucester Railway Carriage & Wagon Co. Class 122 railcar the moment I saw it. I'm now on my sixth generation of such models, having started in the 1960s with a scratchbuilt model of the very similar Pressed Steel (Class 121) version.

Then came a custom-built Anbrico Gloucester car, costing the princely sum of £9 back in the 1960s. This was followed by the purchase of an MTK kit, which was so awful that I gave up trying to build it.

When Lima introduced a three-car Class 117 in the 1970s, I converted the power cars into single units, using my own whitemetal castings. Lima introduced their own Class 121 a decade later, although with a couple of cast metal roof domes you could turn that into a '122'. After Hornby acquired Lima at the end of 2004, the railcar chassis was retooled and fitted with better wheels, a superior mechanism and an eight-pin DCC decoder socket.

Now Dapol has trumped all of those earlier models with a state-of-the-art Class 122. I've already bought two of them and preordered a Class 121, which is due for release later this year. I find that if I know a prototype intimately, no matter how good a model might be, I can still spot potential tweaks. I also like to change the running numbers to represent examples that I've seen or travelled on.



This is the story of what I did to my pair of Dapol 'bubblecars':

W55000: Despite some online controversy regarding Dapol's shade of BR green, I'm happy with the colour. Indeed, I helped Andy and Joel from Dapol choose the shade from a selection of swatches. The original colour faded quickly, giving these railcars a 'washedout' look which would be difficult to reproduce without a complete repaint.

Darkening the colour, as some modellers have done, merely produces a weathered look. The darker green was applied later, with yellow warning panels. Getting an authentic 'washedout and dirty' finish is beyond my ability, so my models remain ex-works.

Jobs to be done on this model included fitting the supplied bufferbeam details, speedometer cable and destination/headcodes. I also wanted to disguise the raised internal floor and add a crew and passengers. The paint job would be tweaked by painting the axlebox covers correctly, and giving the exhaust pipes a more 'used' appearance. In a late change of plan, I also fitted this model with a DCC sound decoder.

SC55007: This railcar is painted in the later, darker shade of BR green, with yellow warning

panels. My aim was to carry out the same tweaks as W55000, including fitting DCC sound, plus a change of identity back to an original 'W' prefix. Different digital sound systems have been employed in each railcar – from YouChoos and Legomanbiffo – allowing a comparison between the two.



TWEAK A DAPOL CLASS 122



The body unclips from the chassis. A few bits of cut-up credit card slipped between the body and solebar will release it. The cab interiors are trickier to remove - I started by unclipping them from either side with a small screwdriver.



The cabs connect to the lighting bar via copper strips. You could unsolder them, but it's safer to unscrew the whole assembly. Easing the strip from the light ducts needs some persuasion - take care not to bend or break any contacts.



I then set about painting the interior, in particular the cream plastic box which shows through the guard's compartment windows. This was treated to a couple of coats of Humbrol acrylic matt black.



Humbrol acrylic No. 62 was applied to the raised floor, rendering it less obvious than the bright cream moulding. This colour suggests the terracotta-coloured linoleum employed on a lot of early DMUs.

Pipe bending

I also adjusted the top of the moulded plastic exhaust pipe so that it lies closer to the destination box. A bit of gentle bending and finger pressure did the trick. The exhaust outlet could also do with a little

bending

backwards.





The stark, white roof domes soon discoloured in service, taking on a creamier tone. After masking, RailMatch acrylic Weathered Stone was applied. I also painted the axlebox covers vellow, with a horizontal red stripe.



Dapol supply an excellent speedometer drive which plugs into one axlebox and an adjacent location in the solebar. The 'cable' is flexible, and it's the first time I've seen this on a 'OO' RTR model, other than the rigid version on railbuses.



I keep a Word document on my PC containing various sizes of destination blinds and other details, for printing onto waterslide decal paper. I change it for each new project, but it saves time finding correct fonts and sizes.



The destination blind decal sits on the outside of the glazing. I found the font size (6pt) by a process of trial and error, but it depends entirely on the length of the word. Choosing short names makes life a lot easier.



By careful cutting you can create partially wound blinds. Mount the decals face down on the inside of the glazing, sealed with a drop of Microsol. A spare set of headcode frames is supplied; keep them in place with a spot of PVA.



The tension lock couplings were removed before fitting the bufferbeam details, following the supplied diagram. Multiple-unit jumpers fit to the left below the bufferbeam, and vacuum hoses to the right in holes in the bufferbeam.

INSTALL A DCC SOUND SYSTEM



Unscrew the seating unit to reveal the speakermounting location, above the bogie. The Legomanbiffo package appears to be a generic DMU kit with a choice of two speakers, neither of which fit the mount in the Dapol model.



Take care not to bend the pins when removing the analogue PCB. Gentle leverage from underneath, close to the mounting pins, will help ease the PCB away. Keep it just in case you ever decide to go back to analogue.



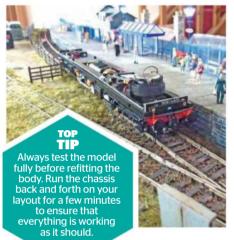
DCC Supplies offers a 20mm round speaker that fits perfectly within the flanged Dapol mounting. Two short, fine wires are needed – I snipped 30mm lengths from the spare speaker and soldered them to the round speaker.



Before fitting the decoder, I soldered the other ends of the fine wires to the tiny terminals marked LS+ and LS-. It's a much simpler job than it seems, requiring only a deft touch with a hot soldering iron.



The speaker needs to be positioned to enable the two flange screws to hold it in place. Once secured, it presents a sealed edge around the speaker. The DCC decoder can then be pressed into place on the 21-pin locator.



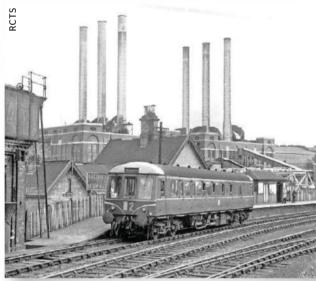
Chris' railcar reflections

The 20 'Gloucester singles', as they were known at the time, were delivered to the Western Region in 1958. Some were put to work on branch services in the London area, including my local Staines West branch, while others plied their trade along various West Midlands routes, including the Shrewsbury-Hartlebury line, the Worcester-Bromyard branch and the Wellington-Much Wenlock branch.

When the latter route closed, a wonderful photograph of a Gloucester railcar standing at Much Wenlock's idyllic station was published in *Trains*Illustrated. That was when I first became aware of these units.

However, my travels on BR did not start until 1962, and by then the 'Gloucesters' had migrated to the West of England.

It was the Pressed Steel railcars that I came to know best (later Class 121). These were remarkably similar to the Class 122, but updated with four-character headcode panels on the roof domes. My first journey on a 'Gloucester' was probably a 1966



trip on the St Ives branch, with W55006. The cars based at Tyseley received 'M' prefixes when that depot was transferred to the LMR. I photographed one such Gloucester railcar, still in light green livery, at Leamington Spa, its freshlyapplied 'M' showing up clearly on otherwise filthy paintwork.

I formed the impression, rightly or wrongly, that after ten years in service and

under their TOPS classification of Class 122, the 'Gloucesters' were less highly regarded than the Class 121. While the latter maintained the Ealing-Greenford and Thames Valley branch services to Windsor, Henley and Marlow, the LMR despatched several of its Class 122s to Scotland, where they were quickly downgraded to parcels cars.

Eventually displaced by second-generation DMUs, a number of Class 121s and 122s were adapted for route learning or Sandite duties. Chiltern Railways acquired W55020 in 2003 and returned it to passenger use, in much-modernised condition. It was fitted with electronic

destination displays and central door locking and decorated in Chiltern's blue and silver livery. By far the most significant alteration to its appearance was the re-routing of the exhaust pipes through the guard's van to the roof, thus neatening the cab end considerably.

Six Class 121s survive in preservation, while W55020/34 await disposal by Chiltern Railways.

Dewsbury Midland

Builder: Manchester Model Railway Society Issues it appeared in: MR129 April 2009, MR130 May 2009

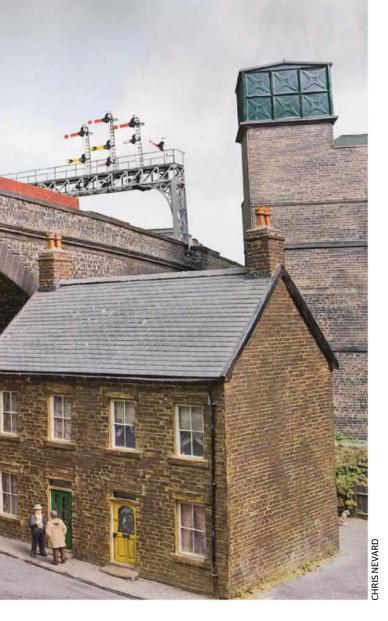

Manchester MRS' 'Dewsbury Midland' is a perfect example of a layout that instantly captures a sense of place and time. Just a quick glance tells you it's set somewhere in a gritty northern conurbation, most likely West Yorkshire, at any point between 1950 and 1980.

Seeing the layout for the first time, at the 2004 Manchester show, it genuinely took my breath away. In fact, I've yet to be enraptured by another layout to the same degree since.

I must have spent a couple of hours poring over the scenic and architectural detail. As with some of the best layouts, the trains become almost incidental, as there's just so much else to grab the imagination.

Every area of the layout makes me feel like I could step into the scene, walk under the damp stone viaducts and climb the steps to the platforms. And yet, the layout is a work of fiction, which makes it even more incredible!





Safton

Builder: Peter Moore

Issue it appeared in: MR3 Summer 1998

Chosen by: Richard Foster, Editor

'Layouts that never leave home': it was a snappy title and one of the key reasons that I chose to buy Model Rail over the competition. The layouts found in people's lofts, spare rooms and garages were just so different to those featured elsewhere.

It felt almost brave to feature the northern grit of 'Tetleys Mills', or the compressed main line of 'Llandudno Junction'.

Peter Moore's 'Safton' epitomised this bravery, for it featured toy trains as well as a model railway. Peter's layout was quite ingenious: he could switch eras between LNER pre-war splendour and post-war Eastern Region excitement

These trains ran on a simple yet effective landscape, a proper model railway if you will. But on the inside of this 8ft by 4ft loop he had a Trix Twin system, crude three-rail track and simple tinplate buildings.

The two should never have gone together and yet, like chilli and chocolate, they did. This was only issue three and I was hooked.



Llandudno Junction

Builder: Chris Evans

Issues it appeared in: MR11 September 1999, MR22 August 2000, MR125 December 2008

Chosen by: Chris Leigh, Consultant Editor

I used to accompany photographer Martyn Barnwell on layout shoots. Chris Evans' layout occupied a complete room, including alcoves which had once been a built-in wardrobe.

I loved the way so much detail had been worked into the space, allowing the main room space to house the junction station,

locomotive depot and even, if I recall correctly, the Britannia tubular bridge. It helped, too, that Chris made good use of old Hornby-Dublo, including the 'short' Mk 1 coaches. These allowed him to run longer trains. I grew up with those coaches so their shortness never bothered me. Chris Evans felt the same.

Bucks Hill

I recall this image of a GWR 'Bulldog' 4-4-0 No. 3331 *Pegasus* rounding a curve with the rolling hills and an old barn in the background. It's one of the most realistic rural model landscapes I have ever seen.

Kevin's 48ft by 8ft 'O' gauge representation of the Welsh Marches is a patchwork of model making expertise, thanks to contributions from some of the best modellers in the hobby (the likes of Maggie and Gordon Gravett, Paul Bambrick and the late Carl Legg).

If photo-realistic buildings and a very unique method of weaving Silhouette Studios' Silflor into carpet underlay (pioneered by Kevin and his friend Chris Gates) wasn't enough, it features some of the most gorgeous kit-built Edwardian-era locomotives to boot!

There really is something very romantic about the early 19th-century railway, a time when locomotives were flawlessly turned out in the most intricate of liveries. In my opinion, that's what 'Bucks Hill' captures better than any other layout - splendour. In fact, it's so splendid it's verging on vulgar - Edwardian Britain would have certainly approved.



HAPPY BIRTHDAY MODEL RAIL!

I am not sure where the last 20 years went but my association with *Model Rail* goes back to its days as a supplement in *RAIL*, which is still avidly read by every railway press office on the network.

Looking through the Bachmann library, I realised just how much the hobby has changed since those early days. Appointing Chris Leigh to edit the magazine initially was a sound move. Chris was followed by Ben Jones and more recently Richard Foster, who have continued to build on the foundations that were laid 20 years ago.

We featured the late Dave Shakespeare's Yorkshire masterpiece on several occasions in my 13 years working on *Model Rail*, partly because he kept making changes to it (some by choice, some enforced by woodworm!) but also because it was just so good.

Dave was the first to say that his aim was to recreate an atmosphere, rather than a rivetperfect replica of 1950s West Yorkshire, and he achieved that gritty, grimy feel of a Pennine industrial town perfectly. Also, with its typical West Riding mix of Eastern and London Midland Region trains, steam and early diesels, passenger, goods and parcels trains, all delivered with an eye for local period detail and a sense of humour, it had something for almost everyone. Featured in MR1, it appeared again on several occasions and was always hugely popular with staff and readers, thanks to Dave's entertaining tales and the wonderful images taken by the likes of Martyn Barnwell and Chris Nevard. Modest to a fault, Dave was nevertheless a very talented and imaginative modeller and his passing in 2014 was a real loss to the hobby.

Carrick Road

Builder: Neil Sullivan

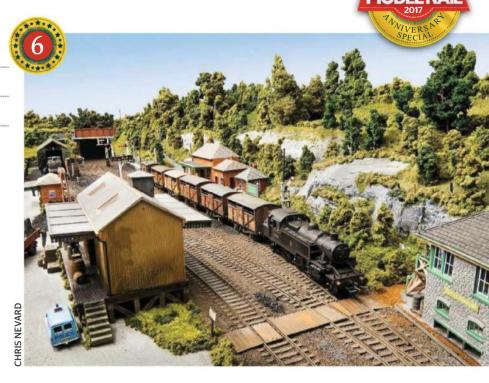

My most memorable layout would be Neil Sullivan's 'Carrick Road' because every element spoke directly to me. It was Cornish, it was a branch line, it had a harbour, blue diesels, 'bubblecars', clay dries and clay 'hoods'. The North Cornwall line has always held a fascination for me and this layout just oozed the feeling of the area.

Around the time it appeared in *Model Rail*, I was working in London and had no idea I would later open a model railway business. When I did, one of the first people through my door was Neil Sullivan, and the great friendship we have shared ever since has its roots in those *Model Rail* articles.

I remember one of his quotes from the article "I don't think I have enough years left to do all the modelling I want to do". I understood that all too well - and I was only 30 back then!

Before long I was commissioning presentation models for NSE from Dave, and he stopped being an editor and became a full-time model maker.

I've seen Dave's layout grow over the last 20 years. It's always fun to watch and there is always something new to see. If ever a layout encompassed the railways of the last 50 years, then this is it. Being 'O' gauge makes it even more of an achievement.

Sub Wealden Gypsum Co.

Any layout that pushes the boundary of our interest is always an exciting prospect. In 3mm:1ft scale, Peter Bossom clearly shows the space benefit of this lesser known and less well-supported scale, and he does so with great panache. Although the layout represents a prototype, the composition is largely fictional. As such, Peter's ability to group buildings in an aesthetically pleasing manner and contain the viewer's eye with effective view blocking holds lessons for us all.

Peter's work reminds me that in all my time as a layout designer, I've never produced a layout design in this or associated scales, particularly 'TT'. I certainly hope to rectify this in due course, and Peter's work is certainly an inspiration.

Kyle of Lochalsh

As I stared at the layout in *Model Rail*, I thought, "Wow, he has captured the real location superbly". It took a while to realise that I'd been fooled: Pete had only modelled half of the station!

The distant hills looked to be a great representation of the real location and the atmosphere was truly Kyle. Pete's eye for the understated details impressed me, from the boats tied up at the quayside to the bits of spare rail lying around.

I confess to being fooled twice - I initially thought that it was 4mm:1ft scale (it's 2mm:1ft). The lovely presentation of the layout rounded off for me what is a memorable layout.

Well done to Pete Matcham! I have long thought about modelling this station location but never got around to it. To see what is possible has encouraged me to have a go myself in the future.



Sydney Gardens

Steve Jones' layout appeals to me because I regularly visited the real location in the 1980s to photograph trains. Sydney Gardens, with Brunel's 'God's Wonderful Railway' was, and still is, a great place to watch trains snaking through a unique location.

'Sydney Gardens', modelled in 'OO' gauge, is an excellent bit of model making, as well as a fabulous miniature vista to watch trains flying through the landscape. When close up and down low, you really feel you are like a giant visiting the actual location - such is the accuracy and attention to detail. But it's not just about the detail - many layouts are very detailed, but they don't feel like a real scene in miniature. Many models of real locations fail, even though they might be accurate technically, but they lack that special something that makes them believable. For me, 'Sydney Gardens' captures that special something.

Ribblehead

Builder: Allen Pearson

Issue it appeared in: MR207 April 2015

Chosen by: Ben Ando, 'N' gauge correspondent

Over the last two decades, *Model Rail* has featured many wonderful 'N' gauge layouts, but my favourites remains Allen Pearson's 'Ribblehead'.

This deceptively simple layout - a twin track loop depicting the celebrated Ribblehead Viaduct and adjacent station - makes the most not just of the scenic possibilities offered by 'N' gauge, but also the very latest in 3D printing techniques to produce arguably the most accurate and definitive model of this iconic piece of Victorian civil engineering.

Sadly, the layout was destroyed shortly after it was photographed for *Model Rail* when, during a storm, a tree fell onto the building housing it. This means that the *Model Rail* article remains the best record of this beautiful piece of modelling, however Allen is now working on a new layout which features not one but two viaducts!









Borchester Market

Builder: Frank Dyer

Issue it appeared in: MR126 January 2009

Chosen by: Dave Lowery, Modelling Consultant

I always have to be different, so I've gone for two layouts, but for very different reasons.

I first went to Bekonscot Model Village on a school trip, and while I loved the buildings, the model railway stole the show. It was the sound of the coaches going over the rail joints that did it. A couple of years ago, I bought an Exley coach from eBay and when I ran it round my layout, it made the same sound that I'd heard all those years ago... wonderful!

The other is 'Borchester Market', which appeared in MR126 (January 2009), and many years later I saw it at an exhibition. For this is all you need for a successful and enthralling layout: a simple circuit, a terminus station, involved pointwork, a turntable and locomotive and goods yards. The stock was built to a lovely, consistent standard, all topped off by working signals.

These two layouts were, for me, the inspiration that got me started, and why I now have such a rewarding life working on model railways.

Catcott Burtle

Builder: Chris Nevard

Issue it appeared in: MR125 December 2008

Chosen by: Nick Brodrick, Editor, Steam Railway

This diminutive yet spacious creation of a Somerset branch line can only be the work of an artist. Perhaps even a genius.

It captures a gentle pace of life. Big skies and 'flat' terrain are immediately recognisable, punctuated by a subtle use of Southern Railway concrete and Somerset & Dorset paraphernalia that gives the layout a strong sense of belonging. You can almost hear the rustle of leaves in the wind and the call of curlews.

Colour, texture and depth of field are all critical elements to the success of 'Catcott'. And being an accomplished photographer, Chris knows how to shape the landscape to create a harmonious scene, which then makes for effective pictures. It's like a 3D Ivo Peters photograph - I can think of no higher praise than that.

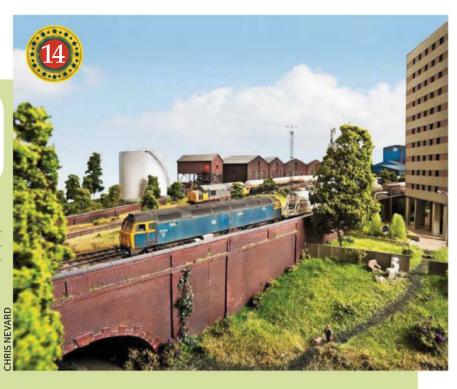

BUILDINGS: SCRATCH VS KIT VS READY-TO-PLANT



I'm starting a new layout and want to hear your thoughts on scratchbuilt, kit-built, and ready-to-plant buildings. Gary Lloyd, Birmingham

Mike says: Some people will tell you that *real* modellers scratchbuild everything, but ultimately this is *your* layout; build what you find most enjoyable and rewarding and you won't go far wrong.

On a more practical note, if you've only ever used proprietary resin buildings but would like to start building your own structures, then kits provide something of a halfway house - no pun intended...

Then again, if you're not one to shy away from a challenge, there's plenty to learn from building your own structures from scratch.

'Ready-to-plant': We're all familiar with the Bachmann Scenecraft and Hornby Skaledale ranges; these proprietary resin buildings are good to go straight from the box. And if you're partial to getting the brushes and paints out, there's no reason why you can't paint or weather them to suit.

Things can get difficult if you're building a specific prototype (although some prototype ranges are available) but the quality of each product and the relative lack of modelling experience needed to put them to good use are attractive prospects - particularly if your sole focus is operation.

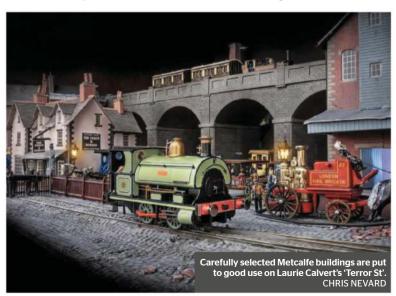
Kit-building: Kits are both rewarding, slightly quicker to make than scratch-builds, and easily customised or

adapted. Back in MR232, Paul A. Lunn demonstrated just how versatile even age-old kits can be – so long as you're willing to get creative.

Some kits, such as Metcalfe's card or 4Ground's laser-cut structures, come already finished and are made specifically to be constructed quickly and easily. Laurie Calvert's 'Terror St' (see image below) is a fine example of a layout that's made almost entirely using Metcalfe structures. In fact, Laurie purchased some of the buildings ready-made at an exhibition. Scratchbuilding: It's the most advanced method of populating your layout with structures. It's time-consuming, difficult to master, and (at times) frustrating, but it's also highly rewarding.

Best of all, you're only ever limited by your imagination – no prototype is ever out of the question. Scratchbuilds can even be a necessity, should you choose to build in a scale that isn't well supported commercially, such as 3mm.

Allan Downes is the undisputed king of scratchbuilding and is famed for his beautifully detailed 1:43 scale chocolate box cottages (see main image). His skills have been honed over the years, and his tried and tested methods are proof that scratchbuilding needn't be overly complicated, time-consuming or difficult.





Bespoke commissions: This is almost certain to be the most expensive option. But it does provide the luxury of ready-to-plant buildings that can be tailored to suit any prototype.

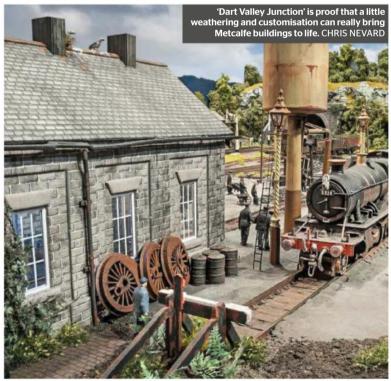
Bespoke kits are also available from etched metal and laser-cut specialists, giving you the satisfaction of building (and sometimes finishing) finescale structures.

Mix and match: A lot of modellers choose to populate their layouts with a mixture of scratchbuilt, kit-built, and ready-to-plant structures – you don't have to stick to just one method!

When mixing building styles, modellers often place the most detailed buildings at the front of the layout, saving the rest for the back. If you're new to scratchbuilding, for example, it might be a good idea to practise your skills on building the less prominent buildings at the rear of your layout, where imperfections won't be quite so noticeable, and keep your more expensive buildings for the foreground.

As always, experiment and find out what you find most enjoyable. This is *your* hobby and it should never feel like a chore.





Upscale funk



RTP and kit-built models are hugely popular, but if there's one persistent bugbear, it's that they're not particularly unique. Yet this is easily remedied - if you're prepared to get those creative juices flowing. You'll be surprised at just how different a commercial building can look with a few extra details and a lick of paint. Common alterations include individual roof tiles, guttering, curtains, and even detailed interiors. Chris Nevard has recently overhauled Metcalfe's

Backscene: Largely 2D backgrounds (can be embellished with areas of relief) that mask where a model railway ends. They can be created using photographs, commercial imagery or paintings, and often depict landscapes or just plain sky.

Technique of the month

Boarding up factory windows

For that gritty look of industrial decay, boarding up windows of factories and warehouses with corrugated iron sheet is a simple way of adding visual interest to drab commercial premises.

It's not enough just to cut out sheets of embossed styrene, however. Scribing, bending and twisting the soft material to create further texture - along with careful painting and weathering - will really bring the buildings to life. (GD)

Cut out sections of the embossed sheet to cover each aperture, before lightly scribing separate, overlapping panels, roughly in scale 6ft by 4ft rectangles. Twist and bend the edges.



Create a rusty texture with a mix of acrylic paints and dry pigments, stippled onto the surface. Finish by lightly dry-brushing with a metallic gunmetal shade to bring out relief.



Secure to the model with cyano, epoxy or PVA adhesive. Such windows are seldom boarded up neatly, so give them a slightly wonky appearance.



MODELLING FARM TRACKS



I want to model rugged farm tracks on my rural branch line layout. The problem is, I'm having difficulty creating

realistic-looking tracks.

Josh Elliott, by e-mail

Peter says: Farm tracks are formed by the wheels of heavy machinery, so the perfect tool to gauge their width is a suitably scaled tractor.

They are often bumpy, so plaster cloth layered atop foam sheet provides a suitably uneven former. I then recommend brushing Woodland Scenics Foam Putty along the entire track to produce a smooth surface. Once cured, paint the track an earthy brown or green and leave to dry.

Now sprinkle sand onto the road surface. Alternatively, I recommend using Woodland Scenics Earth Fine Turf or Treemendus Earth Powder. Use poly fibre to build up the far edge of each track, followed by a sprinkle of suitably coloured scatter (fixed with hairspray).

I used golden/brown static grass fibres to cover each track, pushing the fibres into white glue with my finger - to represent areas



that have been consistently flattened under tyres. The edges and middle strip of grass can be covered in green static grass fibres and applied with a static grass tool. Alternatively. you could use adhesive grass tufts.

It's also worth considering the density of your farm track. If you're depicting a particularly uneven or rocky area, fine ballast chippings can be mixed into your scatter materials to surprising effect.

QUICK FIX – WEATHER PAPER SIGNS



I print my own posters to decorate buildings - any tips on how to weather them?

Roy Hope, via Facebook

Mike says: Fold your posters into quarters - repeat the process several times to emphasis each crease. Folding over a corner or two will also increase realism. Also, don't glue the whole poster down, allow it to peel away from the wall or billboard slightly.

As for weathering, only use dry products: weathering powders, charcoal, pencil, and pastels work well. Avoid paint as it will crumple the paper as it dries.

PROTOTYPE QUESTION OF THE MONTH

I recently bought a Hornby R2769 Class 121 in Chiltern Railways blue livery. A friend of mine says that the model doesn't look

right, but I can't see much wrong with it. What's your verdict? Lesley Brooks, Swindon

Chris says: As the first of its class, W55020 has an interesting history. Having sported the 'standard' sequence of lined green, Rail blue, Rail blue and grey, it was given BR-style chocolate and cream with a silver roof for GWR 150 in 1985. Once the year was over, it was selected to show off the new red, white and blue Network SouthEast livery.

Chiltern carried out extensive modernisation, including LED lights and destination displays. Visually, it was the fitting of central door locking and removal of the cab-front-mounted exhaust pipes that made the biggest difference - not present on Hornby's model.

The central door locking is visible as a square panel welded to the lower part of the door and overlapping the footstep. This allows the doors to be locked by an electromagnet operated by the driver. The exhaust pipes were re-routed through the guard's compartment to a pair of small outlets on the roof, enabling the ugly pipes to be removed from the cab front.

DO YOU HAVE ANY TIPS OR TRICKS FOR DRY-BRUSHING WAGONS?

Having been inspired by a number of George Dent's weathering projects, I've decided to have a go at

dry-brushing a rake of cattle wagons. Can he please give me some tips as to the best paints and brushes to use? N. Tanner, by email

George says: As far as paints are concerned, both enamels and acrylics are suitable, as long as they have plenty of pigment and aren't too thin. As we'll be wiping most of the paint off the brush's bristles, we do need some of it to remain. Additionally, the paint must also be able to transfer to the model effectively.

Over time I've come to prefer a small number of paint brands when dry-brushing - Lifecolor acrylics are my first choice. Alternatively, some Humbrol enamels can also be effective, especially some of the metallic shades for picking out areas of burnished steel.

Sticking with your cattle wagon project, here's a quick demo of how I treated a Bachmann factory-weathered version. With an application of dark weathering wash beforehand, to pick out the planking detail and relief, a dirty off-white shade of Lifecolor was gently dry-brushed over the lower body sides and underframe, to simulate the lime that was used on the prototypes as a disinfectant. By mixing in a little brown, a hint of general track dirt was also suggested.

As for brushes, 'flatties' are by far the best option, preferably with soft bristles. Expo has just introduced a set of flat brushes with the bristles cut at an angle, specifically to help with dry-brushing. I was a bit sceptical at first, but they really do make a big difference!

Dry-brushing takes a little practice to master, with an appreciation of how much paint is needed and the amount of necessary pressure exerted on the brush being the main factors. Remember to keep your brushes clean and in good condition, otherwise the stiff bristles will make the process much more difficult.

To enhance this factory-weathered Bachmann cattle van, MIG Dark Wash was brushed over the body and the excess wiped away with cotton buds. Set aside overnight to dry completely.



Dip the brush into the well-shaken acrylic paint and wipe away most of the paint onto tissue, until only a tiny amount is left. Practise on a textured surface to see how much paint will be deposited.



Gently stroke the brush over the model, working mostly with vertical movements. Mix slightly different shades and repeat the process to add some tonal variation.



Using different shades on the underframe helps to bring out the moulded relief. The treatment of the body was deliberately heavy-handed, aiming for a smeared effect.



THE 'WARWELL' LOW-DOWN



While reading your Hatton's and Oxford Rail 'Warwell' reviews in MR237/8, two photographs came to mind;

a Warrior infantry fighting vehicle loaded onto a 'Warwell' and a Warrior that had fallen off a 'Warwell'... Perhaps you could write a piece on 'Warwells' and their uses? Philip Bullin, via email

Mike says: I have managed to find an image of a Warrior being loaded onto a 'Warwell', which originally featured in MR20, way back in 2000. You'll notice that the well of the wagon has been bridged with a metal contraption called a cradle. The cradle is specially designed to elevate the Warrior above station platforms, since the vehicles – wider than the 'Warwell' deck – are in danger of clipping lineside objects and structures.

However, this presents another problem; by not sitting in the well, Warriors breach loading gauge height regulations. As such, trains are only allowed to operate specific routes that have been vetted by Network Rail. As with other MoD armoured vehicle

trains, the services are not allowed to exceed speeds of 45mph.

Originally introduced to help Sherman tanks clear the low tunnels and bridges of Britain's railways during the Second World War, 'Warwells' were adapted for general freight use (steel/rail carrier and bolster deck variants) as early as 1949.

Early 'Warwells' featured diamond-frame bogies and vacuum brakes, but later MoD variants have been fitted with Gloucester GPS bogies and airbrakes.

As for model making, there's never been a better time to model a military-themed layout. Hatton's and Oxford Rail 'Warwells' are now available to purchase, and Bachmann's hotly anticipated 'Warflat' can't be too far away either.

Tool of the month

The right tool for the job makes things easier, says **Mike Harris**.

The humble spring clamp can be purchased from all good hardware stores and probably even your local supermarket. It comes in a variety of sizes and can be sourced for under £2. The versatility of this tool makes it a workbench essential – especially during those moments where an extra pair of hands would be useful.



Clamps are available in a range of sizes and inventive modellers will use them for a variety of tasks (too many to list here). Their most common use is to hold objects that are being glued - ideal for securing foamboard or underlay to a baseboard. With a little imagination, clamps can even be used to hang up drying models, such as locomotive bodies or trees.



Whether you have an exhibition layout or an awkward-to-reach fiddleyard, removable backscenes can save a lot of hassle. Spring clamps provide an ideal solution, allowing you to both erect and dismantle a backscene in seconds.

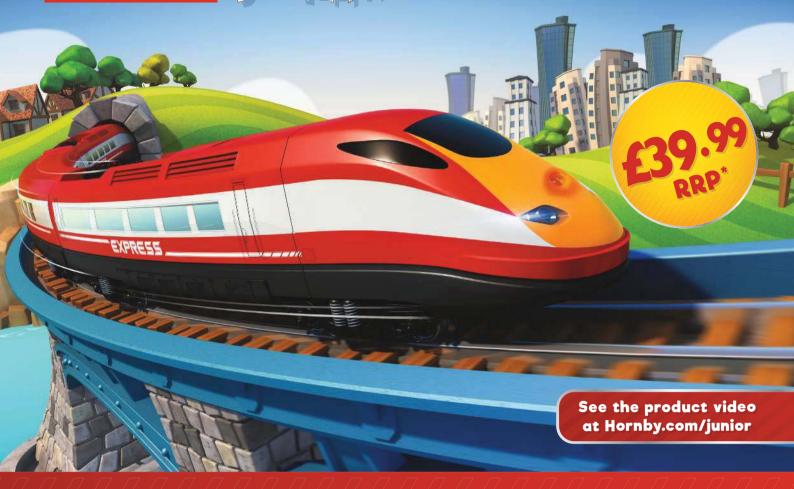

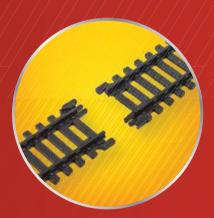

inerva Model Railways has been one of the main forces in the 'O' gauge revolution that's taken place in recent years, offering good quality, ready-to-run models at affordable prices.

It's all very well producing niche industrial designs, but the bia money is in producing mainstream, main line locomotives, so it's no surprise that Minerva has moved into the world of 'Big Four' prototypes. And it's chosen an absolute classic.

The Great Western Railway had a diverse fleet of pannier tanks. Some it built from scratch, others it rebuilt from earlier saddle tanks. But the '57XX', designed by Charles Collett, was the definitive and most typical. A total of 863 were built from 1929 and they were the most numerous class on the GWR

Minerva's first two offerings - a Peckett O-4-OST and a Kerr Stuart O-6-OT - were good, albeit a touch basic. That's not to say they were bad models - far from it - but they were missing the odd detail and could have had a slightly simpler finish in places.

It's immediately apparent that Minerva has pulled out all the stops on the '57XX', as this model is a step above anything it has produced before.

VICTORIAN LOOK

The model really captures the prototype's Victorian look, with its tall chimney and bulbous dome. The 'face' is spot on, with the smokehox door capturing that distinctive dished shape.

Our model depicts the post-1933 '8750' version, which had a larger and more modernlooking cab. The shape matches prototype photographs in Nos. 3 and 4 of Irwell Press' The Pannier Papers.

There are some really fine details: the front sanding linkage, the moulded inside valvegear, and the lamp irons and fire iron brackets on the bunker. All rivets are crisp and accurate.

The tank tops feature a wealth of detail too: wonderfully fine tank filler lids, handrails, vents and lifting eyes (each has a fine wire loop).

There are metal handrails throughout and many of the finer details - the footsteps, lamp irons and so forth - are metal too. The only detail that appears to be missing is a hook under the left-hand buffer to hang the coupling chain upon. Oh, and if we're being really picky, there should be very small footsteps on the buffer shanks.

The cab is a delight, with full firebox backhead detail. Even the gauges have painted scales on them and the coil springs from the rear axle protrude as they do on the prototype. It's a shame that neither the roof ventilator

nor the bunker access hatch open, as they would allow light to shine into the cab to reveal all that lovely detail. The only cab compromise is that there's no hole between cab and bunker.

The '8750' has all of the mod cons you'd expect from a modern 'O' gauge model. There are sprung buffers, a screwlink coupling chain on a sprung hook, an internal eight-pin decoder socket, plus space for a speaker (you can buy a sound-fitted pannier for £360.00 plus P&P).

Access to the DCC socket is straightforward: remove the two screws by the coupling springs and then pull out the balancing pipe beneath the water tank. Be

aware, however, that the pipe comes in two pieces. I thought I'd removed all of it, but I hadn't and got the pipe firmly wedged between the bottom of the boiler and the sand box linkage.



There are obviously going to be lots of variations in a class of 863 locomotives. We've covered the change in cab (the earlier cab version will appear in later batches) but some

contractors built locomotives with welded tanks, while others used rivets. Top feed was introduced in 1943, so Minerva has produced riveted or flush tank versions, with a choice of with top feed or without.

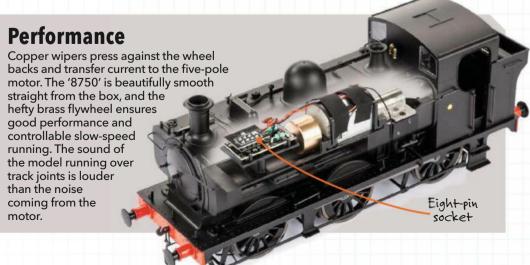
There are myriad other detail differences: two types of whistle shield, steam heat pipework, two arrangements of injector pipework, tool boxes, Automatic Train Control, two types of front steps and the introduction of bunker steps and a handrail.

Rather than facing the tricky prospect of sifting through all these combinations to bring you an accurate pannier, Minerva simply supplies you with all the extra detailing parts in a bag, so you have to choose a prototype and select which components you want to fit. Irwell Press' *The Pannier Papers* is the best reference for photographs.

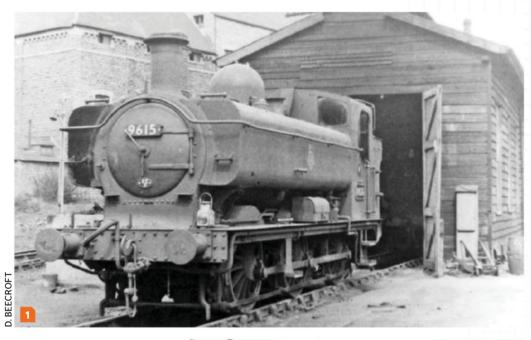
PLATE OPTIONS

You'll notice that our review sample doesn't have any numberplates. That avoids the potential pitfalls of releasing

1: A perfect '8750' portrait: No. 9615 outside Frome shed in April 1958. It has welded tanks, no top feed, a whistle shield and injector overflow pipes outside of the frames.

2: The '67XX' series (both original and later cab designs) were built for shunting but without train brakes or steam-heating. No. 6760 has top feed.



3: No. 7701 was built by Kerr Stuart in 1930 and has riveted tanks.

As a '57XX', it has the original cab style, and steps on the tank fronts

are simple flat ones without the angled edges. Injector pipework

goes outside the footplate.

4: Several panniers in the '46XX' series were transferred to the Southern Region. They sported extra lamp irons on the tank and had AWS equipment, the battery boxes being under the rear bufferbeam. Injector pipes are routed through the footplate.



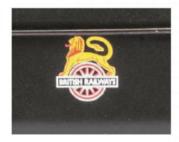




a model with the wrong detail combination. However, Minerva has joined forces with etched 'plate specialist Narrow Planet to offer complete sets of cabside and smokebox numberplates - full instructions about how to order are supplied.

The result is that there's little relief to the plain black livery. The black has a good lustre, the BR 'cycling lion' is neat and well-printed, as is the yellow route availability code and 'C' power rating. Other than the red bufferbeams, that's about it.

If anything would tempt you into a small, 'O' gauge layout, it's this. Dapol has also announced plans to produce a '57XX', but it's still under development. It'll have to be very special indeed if it's going to better Minerva's model. (RF)

t's like that old metaphor about buses again. You wait years for some pre-Grouping Southern coaching stock and then two new models come up for review in consecutive issues. They even both have nicknames! Last month it was Bachmann's SECR 'birdcage' stock, and this time it's a move to the far south-west and Kernow Model Rail Centre's LSWR 'gate stock'.

As two-car push-pull sets, built in 1914 and offering rather basic accommodation, the 'gate stock' served on branch lines and local services. Some sets in the Plymouth area lasted into the late 1950s, powered by 'O2' and 'M7' O-4-4Ts. Kernow's twin packs are thus the perfect accompaniment to their exclusive 'O2' model.

If you're seeking chapter and verse on individual vehicles you should consult www.semgonline. com/files/SR Gate Stock/ GatesPro.pdf but briefly, the story of the 'gate stock' is complex, involving alterations and rebuildings, as well as a couple of renumberings. However, the Kernow models received for review represent two of the two-car push-pull sets in the condition in which they served BR. There seems little doubt that these elderly carriages suffered various patchings and platings in their later careers, and it would not be viable to make tools for every variation. I was pleasantly surprised, therefore, to find that Kernow has endeavoured to incorporate the most obvious variations between the two units in question. Thus, set No. 363, in BR carmine livery, comprises two panelled vehicles, while the green-liveried unit, No. 373, has steel-plated sides. I would not have been surprised to see a single version covering all liveries, so it is commendable that Kernow has gone to the expense of tooling the later, plated bodies for both vehicles. Kernow also offers sets in Maunsell and Bulleid Southern Railway liveries.

In summary, in the carmine set, S2623S was renumbered in 1939 from 6546 (built as 4304 in 1914).

The set number remained 363 throughout. Air-operated push-pull, electric lighting and a SR-style driving end were fitted after Grouping, and First Class was downgraded to Third in 1939.

S737S, built 1914 as 4255, was renumbered 737 after Grouping. It was rebuilt with air-operated push-pull, electric light and SR-style cab end in 1927. The set number remained 363 throughout and it was withdrawn in November 1958, at Lancing.

A similar story covers S2622S and S738S in the BR green set No. 373. This set was the last survivor, withdrawn in June 1960. It was privately purchased for preservation at the Bluebell Railway, but was cut up at Newhaven when local staff apparently ignored instructions from above to set it aside.

IT AIN'T HEAVY...

The first thing I noticed about these models is that they don't weigh very much. That lack of weight is largely due to the austere nature of the real thing, with its open centre vestibule and utilitarian seating, all of which has been neatly reproduced. However, the eye is quickly drawn to the feature that gave these vehicles their nickname, the curious wrought iron 'garden gate' across the open centre vestibule. This was

the only means of entry and exit. Separately fitted handrails and grab irons in an assortment of curly shapes adorn the sides and ends, and the etched metal gates are a work of art.

FYF OF THE BEHOLDER

To my eye, LSWR coaches were seldom a thing of beauty and the Kernow models capture the old and utilitarian look of these vehicles with their large square-cornered windows extremely well. That said, they're attractive in their own way - after a couple of days testing and reviewing these models I'd warmed to them.

Both models feature some very nice panelling on the sides of the cab and quard's section, the carmine set having just the minimalist original panelling on the lower sides of the passenger section. The green set has this area in its final plated-over form, but with dozens of what appear to be tiny rivet heads. A very excellent Colour Rail image of Set 373 shows this area as smooth with little sign of rivet heads, and in fact, those on the model are tiny indentations, rather than raised rivet heads. At certain angles they do indeed become invisible.

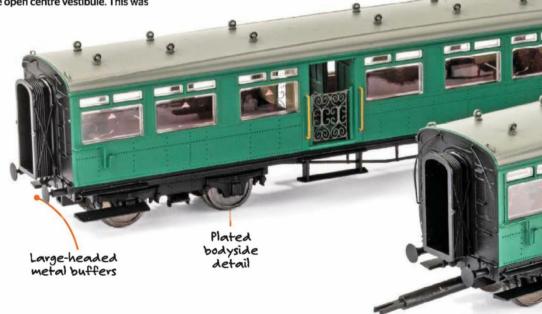
The plastic body shells are flushglazed, providing a good view of



the spartan interiors which are well modelled, with transverse and sideways seating. Even the curved wooden seat ends have been nicely reproduced. There is, however, a seat blocking the gangway end in the driving car, a slip which wasn't spotted until it was too late to correct.

Inside, the carriage walls are finished in cream with the seats in a deep reddish-brown. The windows in the guard's van and cab are quite small by comparison and it is difficult to see inside, but there appears to be no internal detail in these areas beyond the two-tone colour of the walls.

The external finish of both our samples is matt. The green looks





good to my eye and matches well with other SR stock from different manufacturers. However, just as with the 'birdcage' stock, I'm less happy about the shade of BR carmine. It's an OK match alongside Bachmann's 'birdcages'. if a little more purple, but neither really reflects the brightness of the full-size livery. I'm afraid that we just have to be content with the fact that all manufacturers have adopted a similar 'toned-down' version of this livery. Most unusually for plain carmine livery. Set 363 carries waist-level lining, but there's photographic evidence to show that it is quite correct.

TO THE LETTER

Lettering is limited, but what is there is exceptionally fine, the dimensional data and other information on the ends being fully legible under a magnifier, yet almost invisible to the naked eye. 'No smoking' signs are carried on several windows.

The bogies are neatly moulded and fitted with some very substantial steps. They run on 14mm diameter metal disc wheelsets with insulated axles. On the underframe, the brake gear, dynamo and battery boxes are all

separately fitted and the underside of the floor even carries planking detail. The solebars are nicely detailed with moulded truss rods and a full complement of steps below the various doors.

Tension-lock couplings are fitted in NEM pockets mounted on a sprung cam arrangement which draws the cars closer together on straight track when being pulled. On test, the coaches ran well, drawn or propelled by a Hornby 'M7' on curves down to second radius. If you have complex track layouts of sharp radius points, as with any propelling operation, buffer-locking could be an issue.

RAISING THE BAR

A rigid coupling bar, designed to fit in the NEM pockets is supplied in the bag with the hoses and dummy coupling for the outer end. I would recommend replacing the tension-lock couplings between the two cars with the rigid bar. It works wonders! I'd had trouble with buffer-locking at one particular point on our test circuit while

propelling with the tension-locks still in place. Once the rigid bar was fitted, I could propel the set through even the most complex reverse curves on our test track and it performed faultlessly.

Lalso ran the review vehicles on my layout at home with the Kernow 'O2', and it really does look 'the business'. The little 0-4-4T handles the two-coach unit with ease, both pushing and pulling. Like most new coach models, the 'gate stock' falls within the £55-£70 per vehicle price bracket, so perhaps without provision for lighting they are not quite as good value as Bachmann's 'birdcage' stock. However, in my experience most Southern modellers are pretty partisan, and those who model the 'Sou'western' wouldn't be influenced by a few pounds difference in price - especially as a three-coach 'birdcage' set will set you back more than the 'gate stock' twin pack.

First announced in 2011, the 'gate stock' has been a long time coming. Has it been worth the wait? You bet! (CJL)

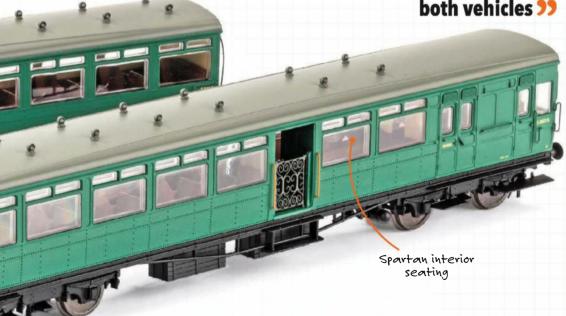

arley MRC was formed in the late 1960s after a chance conversation between workmates at a local engineering factory. From this humble beginning, it has gone from strength to strength.

Fifty years on, it runs the annual National Model Railway Exhibition [NMRE] at Birmingham National Exhibition Centre and owns sizable premises at Pearsall Drive, Oldbury.

We've always been a voluntary organisation with a policy of investing any profits back into

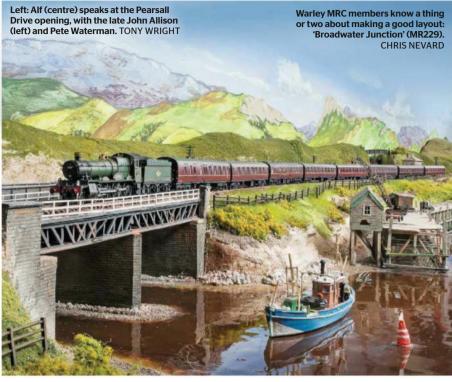
We've always been a voluntary organisation with a policy of investing any profits back into both the club and the organisation of the NMRE. One major advantage of this is that the subscription is an all-inclusive annual cost - there are no extra charges for each visit. Members are able to attend every night the club is open (three evenings per week). Tea and coffee are also included!

In recent years we took the opportunity to become a Charitable Incorporated Organisation [CIO], which has brought additional benefits. As such, the club must comply with its charitable constitution status and is supported by CIO by-laws.

Twenty-five years ago we'd outgrown our exhibition venue and, with expert guidance from Paul Jones, we started looking for new premises. Birmingham offered a number of suitable venues and we opened negotiations with the NEC. This was a leap into the unknown, but with the support of modellers nationwide (and sometimes worldwide) we had a successful first year, and this success has continued.

Prospective members are always welcome and we have a policy of offering an eight-week trial period before they commit to becoming

a full member. Once that decision has been made, members can get involved in whatever aspect of the club interests them. Some just want to spend their time reading in our large library!

We have a number of model railways, ranging from 'N' gauge to 'G' scale and new members are always encouraged to join any or all of the projects that interest them. We have an active student members section for those aged 12 to 18 (subject to them being accompanied by a responsible adult). If they go into higher education, they continue to enjoy the special student subscription rate, with all the benefits of being a full member.

A major focus at the club is the annual Warley NMRE. The running of the show is only possible with the help of the members, who give up their weekends to help run the event.

Set in the Vale of the White Horse, the 1920s/1930s era layout presents a patchwork of contributions from some of the

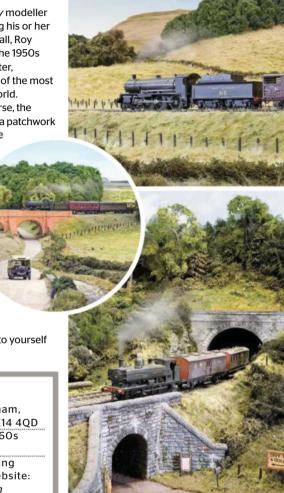
most talented modellers in existence. Our very own Chris Leigh even helped produce the canopy brackets on the model of Culham station.

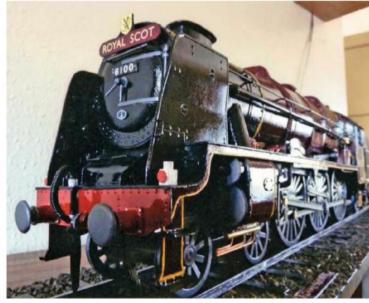
Match the prototype

After inheriting a 'OO' gauge layout, I experienced difficulty maintaining reliable operation. This was because of the usual problems: loose connections, dirty track and engine wheels, and poorly fitted fishplates. All of these factors prevented enough power or electricity from reaching the motor, which drives the locomotive.

It seemed to me that the answer was a locomotive that carried its own power supply, and that a battery was the best way of going about it. So I raided my old toybox and liberated a broken radio-controlled car. I removed the circuit board and wiring and installed it within the locomotive. I now have a radio-controlled locomotive that can run, despite the above problems.

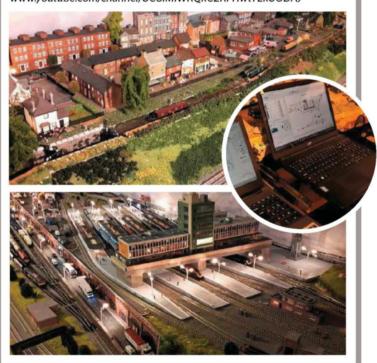
Control system of the future? Alan Whitewick, Wiltshire

Layout spotlight

'**Hedon'** Dennis Cannon, West Yorkshire

This is 'Hedon', my 'OO' gauge layout inspired by the railways of Hull, as they were in the 1950s. Hedon, to the east of Hull, never had a High Level railway, but I built it to serve the dual purpose of hiding the semi-circular end of the layout and also to represent the elevated tracks that carried The Hull and Barnsley Railway.

The layout includes chalk hoppers and cement wagons because there was a chalk quarry at Hessle, on the west side of Hull, that provided raw materials for Earle's cement factory (on the east side of the town). To mimic the extensive docks and the vessels that used it, I've made use of the ship on one of Peco's backscenes too.



A central cut-out provides easy access during maintenance - not to mention a fantastic viewpoint during operation!



The ship from Peco's Dock Centre backscene (SK-20), makes for a stunning dockside backdrop.

Present your case

If there's a locomotive that you think needs to be offered ready-to-run, here's the place to voice your opinion...

Locomotive: War Department 2-10-0

Gauge: '00'

Proposed by: Richard Foster, Editor

There are very few big, sexy locomotives that haven't been offered ready-to-run in 'OO' before - and there aren't many bigger than the War Department 2-10-0. While the WD 2-8-0 version has been part of the Bachmann Branchline range since 1999, no-one has yet touched its bigger cousin in 'OO'.

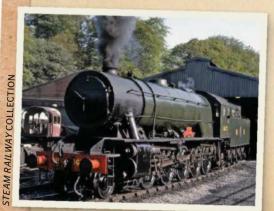
I think this is a missed opportunity. Anyone into modelling military railways would want one, as would anyone modelling the immediate post-war period. BR's 25-strong fleet might have been allocated to Scotland, but they made regular forays down the West Coast Main Line, so you'd have an excuse to run one on any steam-era layout.

And who could resist their looks? They're more substantial than the WD 2-8-0s, vet more slender and daintier than their spiritual successor, the '9F'.

The most eyecatching were, of course, Nos. 600 Gordon and 601 Kitchener that worked on the Longmoor Military Railway. You never see such a bright, colourful livery on such a big locomotive so they immediately grab your attention. It's difficult to imagine the sight of Gordon at Woking in 1966, contrasting with the dirty greens and blacks of BR's trains.

The tide of war turned in favour of the Allies in 1942 and brought a demand for locomotives to move supplies both in this country and abroad, before and after the anticipated invasion of Europe. Robert Riddles, Director of Transportation Equipment for the Ministry of Supply, designed a new locomotive - an austerity version of the Stanier '8F'.

But an even lighter locomotive was needed to run on hastily repaired track, so Riddles and





his team put together a longer, more powerful version, using a 2-10-0 design for its lighter axle load. All 150 were built by North British Locomotive Company, with one, WD No. 73755 Longmoor, becoming the 1,000th British locomotive shipped to Europe after D-Day.

What would make it viable?

Photographic evidence suggests that the WD 2-10-Os remained relatively unchanged throughout their careers, a boon to prospective modellers. BR No. 90774 was easy to spot because of its flamboyant North British

You can always tell Kitchener apart, owing to the large headlamp in front of the chimney (fitted in the mid-1950s), its twin airpumps and, later, because it was oil-fired, the oil tank in the coal space.

There are lots of liveries to go for: War Department, which lasted into the 1950s, BR black with both pre- and post-1956 emblems, and Longmoor Military Railway blue - all would suit British lavouts. You could also offer Nederlandse Spoorwegen and Hellenic State Railways liveries for WD 2-10-0s in Dutch and Greek service too.

Can I see a real one?

Three survive in Britain: No. 600 Gordon is at the Severn Valley Railway, No. 73652 is at the North Norfolk Railway in pseudo-BR livery, and No. 73672 'Dame Vera Lynn' is at the North Yorkshire Moors Railway. Longmoor is displayed at the Spoorwegmuseum in Utrecht, while several 2-10-Os survive in Greece, including No. 964, which is still operational.

Backscene

Musings we couldn't fit into the issue elsewhere, but which seemed very important at the time...

Passing the time in Thetford recently, I was impressed by the attractive station buildings. Only after exiting the platforms and mooching about the car park did I realise that the station actually has two main buildings, boasting contrasting architectural styles and materials.

The original random stone structure dates (I think) from the 1840s and, although partly boarded-up, features ornate gables and chimney stacks. The 'new' building is a red-brick affair that may look a little austere at first glance, but actually possesses some fine detail touches. Featuring an incised name and opening date (1889), this building is still in use as a ticket office and waiting room.

Recent re-signalling work has sadly consigned the semaphores to history, yet Thetford's signal box remains, albeit out of use and appearing unloved.

A siding and traces of the goods yard are also intact, with a traditional wagon height gauge still in situ.

Thetford would certainly make for an interesting modelling subject, with the quintessential Railway Hotel across the car park completing the scene. This was part of my first ever visit to Norfolk and, after travelling along a few lines emanating from Norwich, I'm eager to return and explore more of 'Alan Partridge country'!

One of the joyous things about the railway is that there are always new things to discover, no matter how well versed in railway history you are.

I'm by no means an expert on GWR locomotive matters but I'd say I have a fairly well-rounded knowledge. Therefore, researching GWR pannier tanks for the review of the Minerva '8750'

(see p88) was an eye-opening exercise.

I'd never really paid too much attention to the idiosyncrasies of the design, but a few hours of intensive cramming with Irwell Press' excellent *The Pannier Papers* series revealed some fascinating facts. I had no idea that there were riveted or welded tanks,



depending on builder, or even that there was a batch purely for freight use.

The biggest surprise was to find that one '8750' was even converted to oil firing. I then stumbled across a photograph of it in *Steam Railway* magazine's photographic archive.

BR inherited 93 oil-fired locomotives,

including 36 from the Great Western. However, expanding the oil-firing conversion programme was too expensive and it was cancelled in 1948/49.

So why Robert
Stephenson & Hawthorns
converted '8750' No. 3711
to oil firing in 1958 remains
a bit of a mystery. With the
little oil tank on top of the
bunker, No. 3711 went to
Swindon where, apparently,
it proved to be a powerful
little locomotive.

It moved to Old Oak Common in April 1962 but didn't do much - in fact, any

- work from there before it was withdrawn in May 1963.

How to Mask your models

PRESS IT DOWN

The edge of a cocktail stick is ideal for pushing flexible vinyl tape into awkward spots or recesses without damaging the mask or model. The edge of your fingernail will also ensure that the tape is stuck firmly.

DON'T WORRY

If any paint has seeped beneath the masking, do not despair. Up to a day or two after painting, a cocktail stick soaked in white spirit will loosen the unwanted enamel or acrylic paint.

KEEP IT CLEAN

Surfaces need to be cleaned and previous layers of paint thoroughly dry before masking is applied. Wipe with a little white spirit or alcoholbased cleaner, such as isopropyl alcohol, and allow it to evaporate before painting.

PEEL CORRECTLY

Having painted over a mask. the paint will form a film that has to be broken when the tape is removed. Therefore, take great care and always peel the tape away from the painted edge.

GET THE GEAR

Paint has a nasty habit of seeping between layers of masking tape, so sealing 'joints' with a masking fluid is always recommended. Humbrol's Maskol is widely available from model shops and offers great results for just £3.99. Web: www.humbrol.com

How to Use an aerosol

For best results, aerosols should be used at room temperature, as colder conditions can cause condensation. Immerse the can in a bowl of warm (not hot) water for a few minutes then shake it for at least five minutes before use.

KEEP YOUR DISTANCE

Hold the can about 25cm (10in) from the surface. starting to paint before passing over the model in a steady movement, releasing the button after passing the model. Apply light coats, with a moment's rest in between.

NOZZLE CLEANLINESS

After each session, turn the can upside down and spray until no more paint is emitted. This should clear most nozzles, although removing it and soaking in thinners will make sure it's clean and ready for use next time.

HANDLE CANS CORRECTLY

Paint cans are highly flammable. Keep them clear of naked flames, and store cans away from direct sunlight. Never dismantle or burn empty cans - take them to your local recycling centre.

GET THE GEAR

Never cut corners where health is concerned. All aerosol paints are hazardous and a facemask is essential. Choose one with an approved paint filter and change it regularly. Prices start at £3.20 from The Airbrush Company. Web: www.airbrushes.com

How to Apply a livery

PAINT IN ORDER

The first thing to do is consider the order in which to apply the colour elements. In general, aim to apply the lighter shades first. For example, paint and mask the yellow ends before applying BR blue.

FINE BRUSHES

Once all of the main livery elements have been added and everything is dry, smaller details can be touched in, such as handrails, window frames and other fittings. Use a fine brush and apply small amounts of paint at a time.

SAFE & SOUND

As the paint dries, the wet look will slowly subside to a matt or satin finish. Keep the model safely stored in a warm, dry environment, preferably protected from dust, and leave overnight to harden completely.

MAKE IT MATCH

The model may look a little odd, perhaps with different sheens here and there. The best way of unifying a finish is to apply an overall clear coat. Alclad2 varnishes can be airbrushed without thinning and offer great results.

GET THE GEAR

Sable-haired paintbrushes offer unparalleled performance with most paints (quick-drying acrylics will take their toll). Lifecolor's sable-haired brushes are recommended. Web: www.airbrushes.com



Airbrushing Essentials

WHAT IS IT?

A tool designed to atomise a liquid into a fine spray, using compressed air to project this liquid onto a surface. The air has to be produced by an external source and the air and liquid are both controlled by a trigger.

KEEP YOUR DISTANCE

If spraying at the recommended low pressure, you need to be fairly close. Between 3in and 6in (75mm and 150mm) is about right for most jobs. When weathering, you can get right up to the surface, but this takes a bit of practice!

THINK THIN

Always use the thinners recommended by the paint manufacturer. Water can be used with some acrylics, and white spirit with certain enamels, but these will result in longer drying times.

UNDER PRESSURE

We only need to work with low pressures, usually between 10-18psi, so a controllable air supply is preferable. If using a compressor or propellant can without a pressure control, try an in-line valve. Use trial and error to set the pressure for correct paint flow.

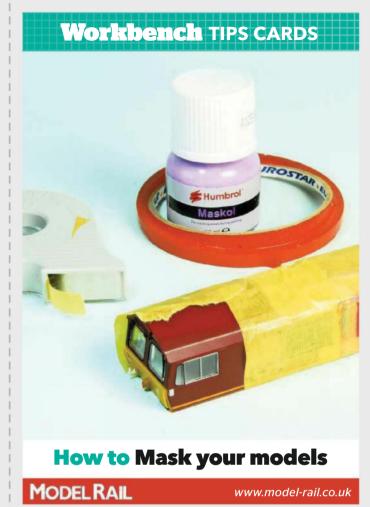
