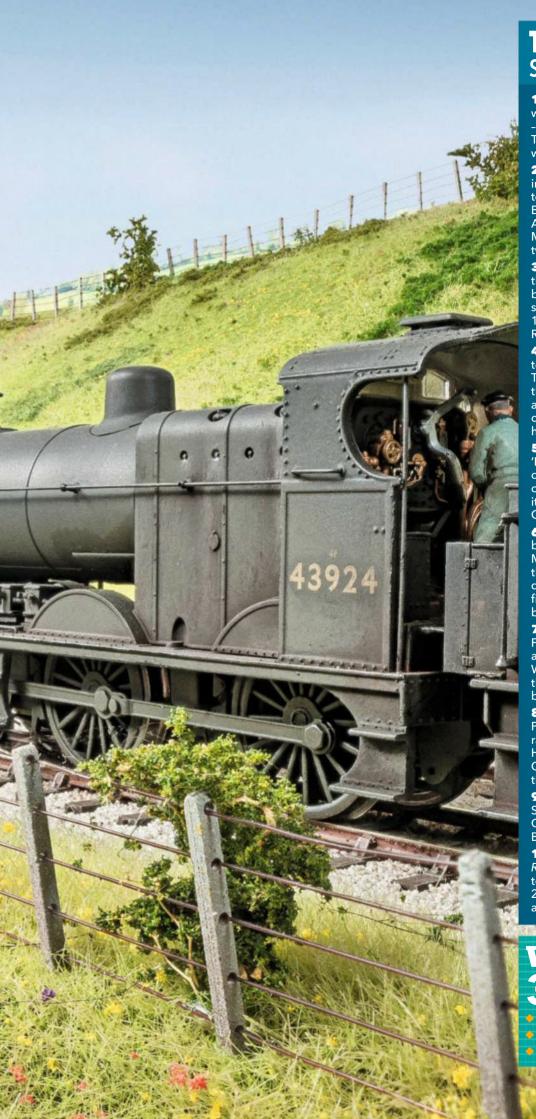






# Opening the box The latest happenings from the world of model railways





### **TOP TEN FACTS**Somerset & Dorset

- 1 The Somerset & Dorset Railway was created on September 1 1862 despite the 16-mile gap from Templecombe to Blandford, which wasn't filled until 1863.
- **2** The Somerset & Dorset Railway was in the hands of the receivers when it took the brave step to build a line to Bath from a junction at Evercreech. Authorised in 1871, the route over Masbury summit was finished only two years later.
- **3** The GWR wanted to take over the Templecombe-Bath section, but the LSWR and Midland Railway stepped in and, on November 1 1875, the Somerset & Dorset Joint Railway was born.
- 4 The Western Region finally took control of the SDJR north of Templecombe in 1958 and many see the line's closure on March 6 1966 as an act of revenge. Strangely, steam on the rest of the Western Region had ended in January 1966.
- **5** The Manchester-Bournemouth 'Pines Express' was the S&D's only named train. The name outlasted the S&D, however, and it was finally dropped by Virgin CrossCountry in 2002.
- **6** In 1907, after numerous requests by S&D Locomotive Superintendent M.H. Ryan for large locomotives, the Midland Railway prepared two designs but neither were built. The first of the famous '7F' 2-8-0s was not built until 1914.
- **7** Due to an increase in traffic, five Fowler '4Fs', classified by the S&D as '4P4G', were built by Armstrong Whitworth in 1922, especially for the S&D. It took another three years before more '7Fs' were built.
- 8 Famed S&D photographer Ivo Peters enjoyed a brief career as a racing driver in the mid to late 1930s. He could get from Bath to Shap, in Cumbria, in four hours - long before the construction of motorways!
- **9** When it opened in 1954, the S&D station in Bath was called Bath Queen Square. It was then renamed Bath Green Park.
- **10** Model Rail's sister title Steam Railway organised for '7F' No. 53809 to return to Bath Green Park in 2006 to commemorate the 40th anniversary of the S&D's closure.

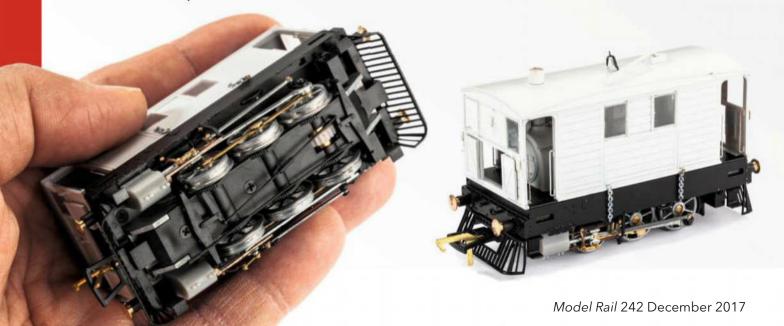
## 'J70s' - IN THE FLESH!

### DAPOL CLASS 50 IS A GO



Dapol will produce an 'N' gauge Class 50. Its take on the classic English Electric Co-Co was one of several long-awaited models that were put on hold during the summer as Dapol reviewed its outstanding 'N' gauge products.

Rather than drop the project, Dapol has promised to produce the '50' to a specification akin to its forthcoming Class 68, and has called it its "second 'Next Generation' diesel".

The '50' will sport Dapol's new iron-cored five-pole motor which, it promises, has excellent slow running and exceptional pulling power. The model will also feature Dapol's new 'smooth drive' low-maintenance chassis, Next18 DCC socket, provision for sound and fully controllable lighting.

Four guises have been announced: BR blue D406 and 50043 in original condition and



'Large Logo' 50040 Leviathan and 50037 Illustrious in original Network SouthEast livery (both refurbished). DCC Supplies has also commissioned a limited run of 50015 Valiant in BR Engineer's 'Dutch' livery.

The '50' is expected to enter production in mid-2018, RRP starts from £170.50.

### DAPOL BRINGS WAGON WORK TO THE UK

Dapol has added five new wagons to its 'O' gauge range - and they're to be made in Britain! The quintet are all based on a 9ft-long wheelbase and the range comprises a seven-plank salt wagon, a nine-plank lime wagon, a five-plank open wagon and two seven-plank opens (one with two side doors and one with side and end doors).

**Dapol Marketing Manager** Neil Morrlle told Model Rail:

"Back in April, Dapol announced that it had invested in new equipment with the intention of enhancing its UK production abilities. The five new 'O' gauge wagons are our first 'down payment', making good on this promise to modellers.

"They will be produced at our facility here in Chirk by our existing production team, and we have a lot of confidence in their abilities. Plans are in place to further enhance the range of

products produced in the UK. whether this is through all-new tooling or, where prudent, [by] bringing tooling back to the UK."

The five new wagons will sport detailed injectionmoulded bodies, compensated chassis, sprung buffers and sprung couplings. All five models will initially be offered in two guises. RRP for the lime and salt wagons is £49.95, while the open wagons retail at £44.41.

### **IRISH UPDATE**

Irish rolling stock specialist Irish Railway Models has published an update of where its next projects are in the production process. The next wagon, which follows its CIÉ ballast hopper (MR237), is the CIÉ/Irish Rail cement 'bubble' and production is well under wav. As this issue closed for press, IRM expected that the wagon was to have been available at South Dublin MRC's show on October 28-30. Production had been delayed to incorporate etched components and finer chassis detailing.

Tooling has started on IRM's third project, the Tara Mines bogie open wagon. An engineering prototype is due imminently. IRM will confirm guises and prices when the EP is complete.

### News Real what's happening on Britain's railways...



#### ■ Five alive

BR Standard '5MT' No. 73156 has returned to steam at the Great Central Railway. The 4-6-0 is the only one of the five '5MTs' in preservation to be built at Doncaster. It was withdrawn in May 1968, languished at Barry until 1986 and initially moved to the East Lancashire Railway for restoration.

#### **■**A halt with potential

Hayles Abbey Halt, on the preserved Gloucestershire-Warwickshire Railway, is one of Britain's newest stations. The GWSR re-opened the halt during the summer, on the site of the original, which BR closed in 1960. It would make an ideal 'OO' micro layout, using Bachmann's 44-0055 GWR Pagoda Shed & Store.



#### Blue is the colour

Class 68 68021 Tireless has received this rather striking livery. It's one of 14 Class 68s allocated for use on TransPennine Express's Liverpool-Manchester-Scarborough-Middlesbrough trains. The livery is made all the more unusual as it takes advantage of a change in regulations, which means that a yellow warning panel is no longer mandatory.

### **Constructing 5" Gauge Wagons**

'Weighty tome' is quite literally the best way to describe this new work from Doug Hewson and published by the HMRS. It's a whopping 316-page hardback. It may not immediately seem relevant to 2mm, 4mm and 7mm modellers, but it contains a huge amount of prototypical information, including useful tables listing batches and detail differences of all manner of open wagons, vans and brake vans from BR, the 'Big Four' and earlier. Also

included in the handsome cardboard box are 16 A2/A3-scale drawings. Not cheap, but wagon enthusiasts should find it a useful addition to their collection.

The new scheme matches Virgin East Coast's new IEP fleet and could be easily changed should Virgin not win the new West Coast Partnership franchise in 2019. 390010 was repainted at Alstom's new Widnes workshops

#### ■ New life for HSTs

ScotRail has unveiled artist's impressions of how its new fleet of HSTs will look. Some 54 Class 43s and 121 Mk 3s are being overhauled for a new life in Scotland where they will be formed into nine four-car and 17 five-car sets to link Edinburgh, Glasgow, Perth, Dundee, Aberdeen, Inverness and Stirling.



### **■** The Wight stuff

Class 33/2 33202 'Dennis G. Robinson' became the first ever diesel-electric locomotive to work on the Isle of Wight. In fact, it has become the most powerful locomotive to ever work on the island. The 'Crompton' visited the Isle of Wight Steam Railway for its autumn diesel gala and stands at Havenstreet with the 1031 to Smallbrook on October 1.

### Wheel Specifications for the Modeller

It is essentially a list of every main line steam and diesel locomotive built from the 1870s until the present day, although the most modern AC electric is the Class 87. A sneak peek into the world of the professional model maker...





Just finished off two interesting 'O' gauge coaches. One was a Mk 3 sleeper, the other a Mk 1 postal, both of which were in blue/grey livery.

Because of the fine white line around the waist of the vehicle, I resisted adding the final small detailed castings until the paint job was finished - then I could glue them on with one of today's excellent adhesives.

Here's something I've learned from past mistakes – if you just glue the fittings to the painted body some of them are bound to come adrift, along with a tiny bit of paint. So now I always remove the paint around the hole and the back of the fitting, so you get a decent bond with the metal.



MD of GBRf John Smith is a Sunderland FC supporter. Class 66 66725, which was originally named Sunderland, has been repainted into the new corporate livery and adorned with a Sunderland FC scarf and club logo. John Peck of Precision Labels did a remarkable job on the transfers for the model I repainted for the staff presentation to Mr Smith.

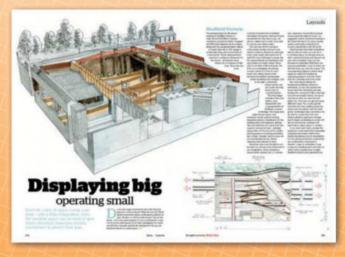

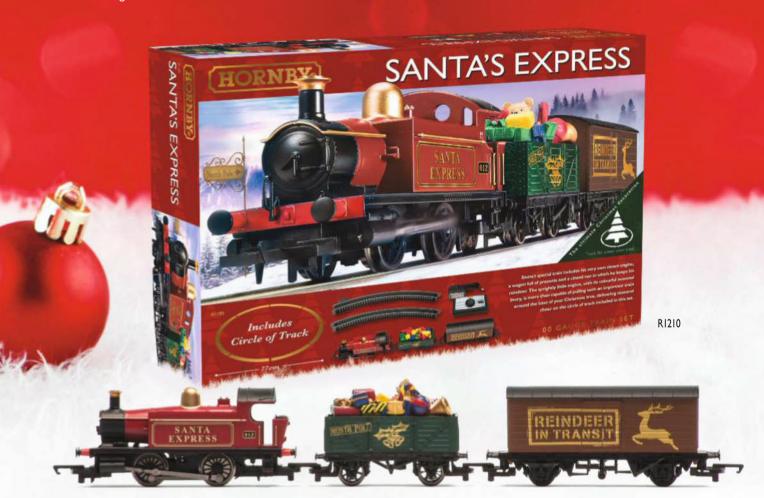

### **According to Chris...**

Prompted by 'Modelling Lives' (p18), **Chris Leigh** provides a personal perspective on the subject of 'beginnings'.

ne of my regular jobs on *Model Rail's* small 'in-house' editorial team is to read page proofs. With modern technology, a largely finished proof of a page is the first that I see of an article. It wasn't always like that.

of an article. It wasn't always like that. When I started as an editorial junior on *Model Railway Constructor* in 1963, the first proof was a 'galley proof'. The galley was a long tray in which the metal type was assembled, all set to a standard column width, measured in 'ems'. I've not seen that measurement used since computers revolutionised typesetting.

Back in 1963 we typed our articles and reviews on paper, double-line spaced so that there was plenty of room for the Editor to write his instructions and alterations. I recall my early efforts being returned from the Editor with a mass of alterations. That was how I learned my publishing craft, especially when it came to writing reviews. Editor Alan Williams was a master reviewer. His comments were fearless but never unfair, unjustified or made in an offensive manner. It was a great way to learn.

That paperwork then went to a typesetter, who re-keyed it on a machine that turned it out as metal type on a galley. That, in turn, went to a compositor, together with a rough plan of how it should look on a page with photographs added. Only then might we get a page proof and it was likely that only the Editor would see it. Corrections at that stage would be rare – and expensive.

I've just read the page proof of Nigel Harris' 'Modelling Lives' contribution about the birth of *Model Rail* (page 18), and his memories are spot-on. He was involved in meetings with senior staff after we had spent many hours shut away, thrashing out the content.

Nigel and publisher Clive Nicholls had a background in numerous successful publications, but little or nothing as far as railway modelling was concerned. I came from a background in railway modelling but I had the dubious distinction of having had a magazine, *Model Railway Constructor*, close

while under my editorship. That was still fresh in my memory – MRC wasn't the only model railway magazine to fold in the 1980s.

I did, however, have lots of ideas about what I had wanted to do with MRC, but getting investment in an ailing magazine was never likely to happen. Those ideas had been pigeon-holed, but the *Model Rail* meetings gave me a chance to try them out. Now I was working with people who were willing to listen. Clive's commitment to *Model Rail* was never more clear than when I looked out from behind Egham club's 'Fraser Canyon' layout at the Warley show to find him holding a Tri-ang Class 31 that he'd just

bought (above). I'd never known a publisher to attend a show before, and we were still a year away from launching *Model Rail*.

I knew I'd hit a home run with my comment about building kits. It arose from my frustration at seeing magazine reviews of kits that were merely based on a manufacturer's photograph and a quick look at the bits in the box. But you can't review a kit unless you've built it, because that's the only way you find out if the parts fit together.

Nigel's 'Layouts that never leave home' epithet caused me more than a little concern.

How would we know if someone had a layout in his loft? I need not have worried. We operated hand-to-mouth for several issues, but such has been the popularity of layout articles that there are now four monthly magazines featuring a dozen layouts

a month, and there seems no sign of the supply drying up. Perhaps that, more than anything else, is a measure of how popular the hobby is, because for every modeller who has a layout fit to publish in a magazine, there must be several with no layout, an unfinished layout, or just a collection of locomotives in a cupboard. That suggests a market that was, indeed, worth launching a magazine into.

Twenty years on it is perhaps true to say that the model railway hobby was less buoyant then than it is now, and the leap of faith that launched *Model Rail* was truly inspired.

### **Modelling Lives**

Tales from the world of railway modelling.



Co-founder of Model Rail Nigel Harris recounts the magazine's difficult

birth, and how its inception was a seminal moment in railway modelling publishing.

n 1965, I was eight years old and vividly recall an early Sunday afternoon TV programme called *All Our Yesterdays*, presented by a rather dour Brian Inglis. It took a week-byweek look at developments in the Second World War and a repeated refrain in the script was "20 years ago today..."

To a bored-silly eight-year-old (back then, absolutely nothing happened on a Sunday!) 20 years seemed a timespan of unimaginable length. Five decades later, perspectives are rather different and to think that it's a similar span of 20 years since I was one of three people in the *Model Rail* launch team is a sobering moment.

It seems hardly any time at all – which makes me take a slightly wide-eyed look back to 1965 to think that at that point the end of the Second World War was in reality much, much closer than it seemed to me at the time. It certainly places a lot of things said in the 1960s by my parents in a new perspective.

But back to Model Rail. In 1997, I had been editing RAIL for barely two years. The fatal Southall crash happened that year, and the newly privatised railway was going through painful teething troubles. One of the legacies I'd inherited was an occasional 'Model Rail' supplement, tucked into RAIL. In truth, it was a vehicle for generating some advertising revenue and included a handful of editorial pages. Some years before, I'd recruited lifetime railway journalist Chris Leigh to join us from Ian Allan (we'd worked together on magazines and books in the 1980s) as editor of Steam World. A former editor of Model Railway Constructor, Chris rejuvenated the editorial content in Model Rail, which he had turned into a tidy little free 'extra'. I was really pleased at the reaction it prompted from readers and advertisers alike. It was food for thought for sure.

#### A DIFFICULT BIRTH

It was, however, becoming an increasingly uncomfortable fit in *RAIL* (which we had started developing into the magazine you see today) but it was a quality product and I didn't want to see it simply scrapped. As a lapsed railway modeller (with my dad, I had been an early British 'N' gauge adopter from c1970) I started to wonder if we could launch *Model Rail* as a magazine in its own right. Chris and I both worked for Publisher Clive Nicholls and it's largely thanks to him you're reading this today – because *Model Rail*'s birth was not an easy one.

Clive was thinking along the same lines and, after hearing Chris' positive and supportive view, the MR launch team was born. From the outset, Clive was determined that *Model Rail* should be fresh and different. To have any chance of longevity, it had to break the mould from which most model railway magazines seemed to have come.

And my goodness, was that mould hard to

We had to work very hard to avoid being sucked into the same old way of doing things. Railway modellers, we discovered, were very much creatures of habit!

To start, I looked at the market-leading Railway Modeller. I was dumbstruck to find it was still largely the magazine I had last seen more than two decades before, in about 1975. Nothing seemed to have changed, and so we judged the market to be wide open for change. For something new. Emap had pulled this off in 1979 when David Wilcock's Steam Railway blew apart the complacent market in which IA's Railway World and IPC's Railway Magazine had jogged comfortably (and rather tediously, I have to say) along.

There were, however, plenty of siren voices warning us off. "Oh, model railway journalism is a very hard rock to beat your head against – plenty of publishers have tried and failed in this market." We heard lots of that.

This only made Clive and I more determined than ever to make sure *Model Rail* was markedly, noticeably and

realistically different to any previous or existing model railway magazine. The market looked very complacent. We were determined to be compelling.

We spent hour after hour, alongside our day jobs, in editorial development meetings exploring how we would treat layouts, construction, reviews – the whole spectrum of coverage. We were determined to reinvent all of it, but we had to fight hard against plenty of what we saw as stultified tradition in terms of approach. "That won't go down well," we were told. "That isn't how things are done in model railway magazines." We were determined not to be put off in our resolve to make this magazine different. No way would MR be a 'me too' magazine.

#### LIGHT BULB MOMENT

Chris Leigh played a very important part. His lifetime experience in all aspects of model railways and its magazines was crucial – he was well known, well respected and gave the embryonic magazine a flying start in ensuring credibility in the industry and among customers alike. Chris also helped unlock some key approaches. For example, after a couple of hours of unsuccessful wrangling one day over how to articulate the new magazine's overall philosophy, he suddenly said: "If it's a kit we actually build it – if it's not, then we take it apart."

Clive and I looked at each other in delight – Chris had delivered a classic light bulb moment. From that point on the entire editorial philosophy flowed fairly easily and within a couple of hours an entire outline editorial strategy was in place. This clarified our thinking and context and it underpinned our selection of material. It was, of course, the same material everyone else was using – but this new philosophy meant that *Model Rail* really would be very different.

I remain very proud of my specific contributions. As a young modeller, in the early 1970s, I'd struggled to match the few photographs of a layout with where they'd been taken, despite the provision of a track plan. I came up with the little camera graphics that adorn MR's excellent track plans to this day.

As a junior member of the Pendle Forest MRS in Nelson, in my early teens, I had noticed the major difference in quality between the layouts built for exhibition in the clubroom and the much higher quality layouts built permanently into the lofts of top quality members/modellers like Alan Catlow (whose work had appeared in Railway Modeller several times) and John Porter. This led directly to the 'Layouts that never leave home' concept. I was told quite often that these were in short supply and we wouldn't have enough - but we persevered and successfully unearthed some real gems. Model Rail still mines this seam today. Masterclass also evolved easily, once our way of thinking was finalised.

There were other hurdles. Internally, Emap

was not at first convinced by our idea. I recall one particularly unpleasant board presentation that Clive and I attended, to try and secure permission to launch. We were given such an aggressive mauling that I told him never again! The answer to our proposal was a resounding, unpleasant and rather aggressive 'no.'

I was gutted. After all that work and with such a great package in prospect too.

"So, what do we do now?" I dejectedly asked Clive, as we walked away from that bruising board encounter.

"We're going to do it anyway," said Clive. Even in those far off days, when powerful publishers exerted a good deal of authority and enjoyed considerable freedom of action, this was... bold, to say the least. But he was as good as his word.

So Model Rail quietly appeared on the news stands, without fanfare, as a quarterly. Or rather, a series of one-offs! It went really well. So it started appearing more often as a bi-monthly. Or, I should say, a slightly more frequent series of one-offs. It was received brilliantly. We were encouraged to give a board launch presentation another go. It would not be good for our careers to launch a monthly magazine without board approval!

Clive persuaded me to accompany him back to meet with the board and present the

renewed MR launch proposal for monthly publication. And this time it flew through. I recall one particular reaction to our proposal from one of the most influential – and challenging – directors there.

"A successful launch requires that a magazine has a clear, strong and compelling USP (unique selling point)," he said. "I have never before seen a magazine launch proposal with quite so many USPs. We should do this."

### DARE TO BE DIFFERENT

And so Model Rail came to be launched as a monthly magazine. The long hours which Clive, Chris and I had spent thrashing out new and different editorial approaches and treatments had been well spent. Emap had decades of experience in very successful hobby magazines of all kinds, from football and fishing to motorbikes and bird watching and so yes, we excluded nothing from our appraisal process, as Chris commented in his own look back at this magazine's launch in MR241. Had we not been so determined to dare to be different, the dead hand of established model railway magazine tradition would have produced another magazine like all the rest. It would not have survived.

The success of *Model Rail* since clearly validates our approach – but so does the fact

that many of the editorial approaches, techniques and methods which MR pioneered were quickly copied by the established magazines and they are now commonplace. Imitation is indeed the sincerest form of flattery – but it also creates

problems. Once your competitors look just like you, how do you stay ahead?

Well, as successive editors, Chris Leigh, Ben Jones and Richard Foster have, over the last 20 years, not only delivered wonderful masterclasses in modelling, they have also delivered a masterclass in magazine craft and you're holding the result right now. I look at other modelling magazines and it is very obvious how MR drove change in a previously stagnant area of the market.

Thanks to Richard's leadership, this magazine is more impressive now than it has ever been and I always look forward to the moment when each new copy drops on my doormat. I'm really proud to have played a part in creating and launching it. I've been lucky to edit three market leaders in my career (*Steam World, Steam Railway* and *RAIL*) but there isn't an editor alive who doesn't want to be involved in a successful launch. And being one of the three-member MR launch team is absolutely one of the highlights of my editorial career.

# Modelling a forgotten RAILWAY

The challenge of building a Victorian era layout appeals to both **David Bousfield's** love of ornate liveries and his passion for historical research.

### LAYOUT HADLEIGH

s newer generations enter the hobby, its thematic focus shifts. Right now, we're witnessing more Transition period and BR blue-era layouts than ever before. Why?

Because most of us model what we can remember. And yet, David Bousfield finds much to enjoy poring over reference materials and sourcing what limited photographic evidence he can find in a bid to create the most authentic representation of the Victorian and Edwardian-era Great Eastern Railway possible.

The mid to late 1800s and early 1900s represent a romantic and innovative chapter in the history of Britain's railways. Prior to the First World War, the rail network was awash with ornate, vivid liveries and flawlessly turned-out locomotives. It's a period that begs to be modelled.

from 1911 and have worked back ever since. I'm particularly interested in regulations set by the Railway Clearing House [formulated in 1842].

As David puts it: "Working in the Victorian era involves piecing a lot of information together - photographic evidence is somewhat sparse." And yet he relishes the challenges that the period brings, because his favourite part of building a model railway is researching prototype history.

to gather research for locomotive and wagon scratchbuilds."

Despite his interest in historical accuracy, David is prepared to be a little creative with history, should it benefit his enjoyment. For example, he actively enjoys contriving reasons as to why stock from other railway companies might find its way onto the GER branch line terminus. "It's a leap of the imagination," admits David. "Both 'Wells-next-the-Sea' and 'Hadleigh' take liberties in regards to strict historical accuracy, if only for the sake of producing additional atmosphere and variation, to further the enjoyment of playing trains."

### BLUE IS THE COLOUR

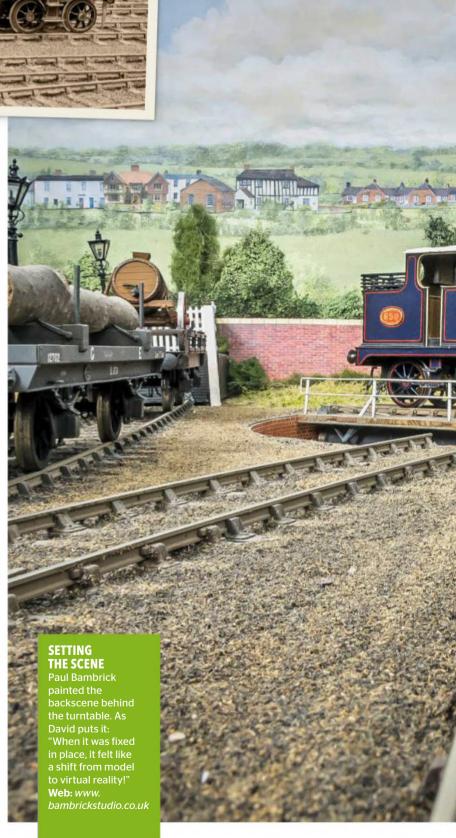
Much of David's fascination with the Victorian and Edwardian-era GER railway comes from the aesthetic appeal of its many liveries. "I grew up reading about Thomas the Tank Engine in *The Railway Series*," he says. "The locomotives are all different colours, similar to what you'd have found in and around the GER prior to the First World War."

The absence of colour photography and the dearth of surviving stock can make identifying the exact colour of certain items of rolling stock virtually impossible. The up side, of course, is a little artistic licence when mixing swatches for stock. For modellers of 19th century railways, there's a huge variety of colours to choose from. David says: "Pigments and varnishes were built up in layers and could look quite different, depending on lighting. Also, the blue did vary; the Cambridge version is said to have been lighter than the Stratford version, for example."

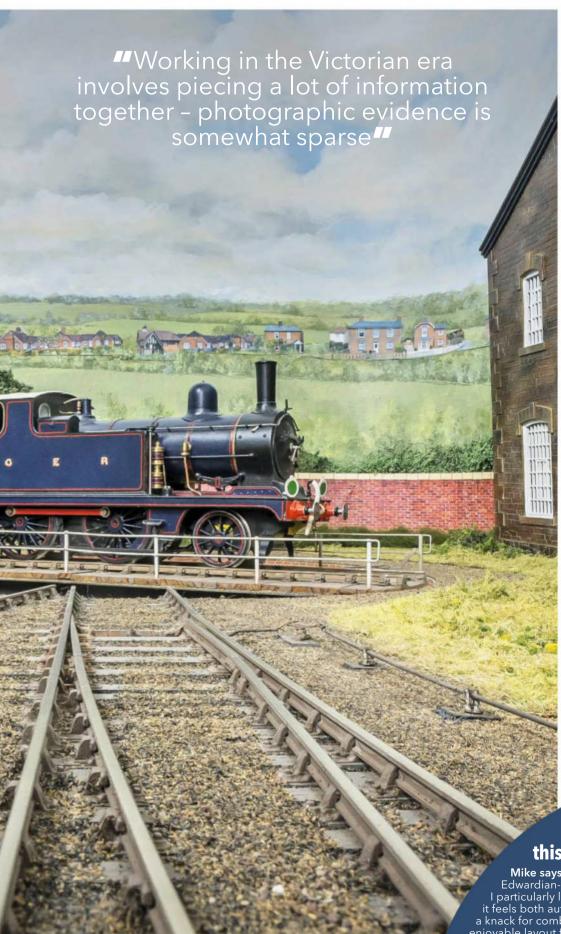
The Victorian era presents a melting pot of vivid liveries; the GER alone provides ample opportunity for colour variation. Some of the railway's earliest locomotives were painted in a shade of yellow ochre – sometimes referred to as canary yellow. A pea-green livery was also used by the GER during this period.

In 1882 the famous blue GER livery was introduced. David explains: "It was T.W. Worsdell who first introduced GER ultramarine blue livery. A variation of the livery first appeared on '134 Class' 0-4-4 No. 189, which hauled Queen Victoria's train to Chingford on May 6 1882. The standard GER blue livery appeared at the end of the year on the first of Worsdell's new locomotives, the 'G14' 2-4-0s." From 1890, goods locomotives built after 1883 could be identified by an unlined black finish, with GER blue still used on mixed-traffic and passenger locomotives. Until 1919, coaches were turned out in teak.

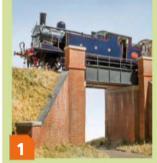
David hasn't just relied on documented sources during his research, he's also engaged in an

#### **THE CAMERA NEVER LIES?**

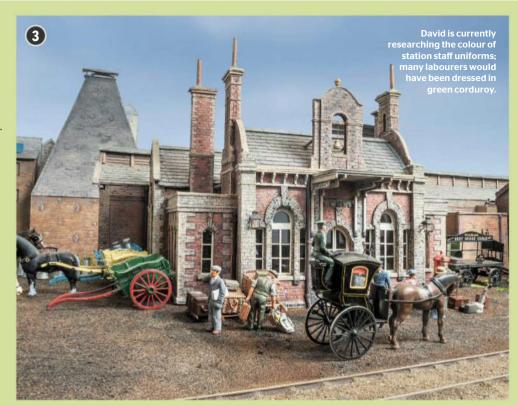
Although Hadleigh station was closed for good in 1965, the main station building and maltings survive today as private dwellings.

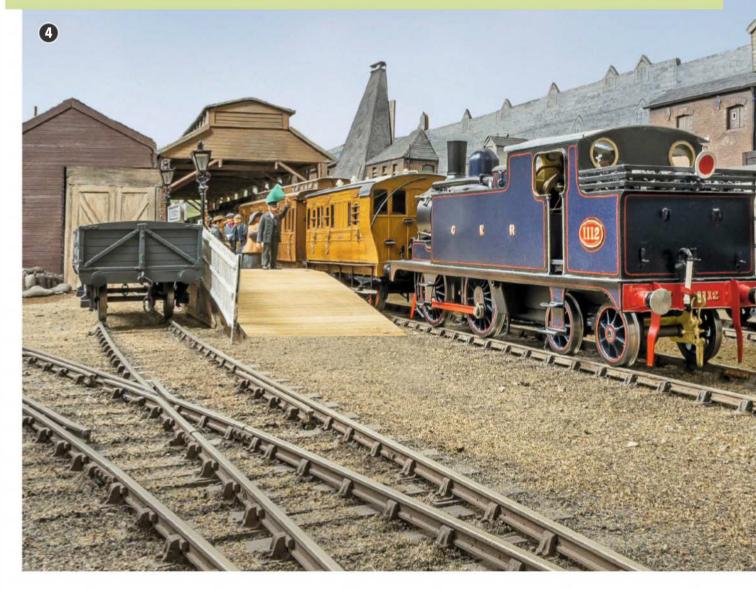
Fortunately, David was afforded the opportunity to photograph and measure the buildings and used the information to produce scale drawings. The drawings were sent to John Mace, who built and painted bespoke buildings for 'Hadleigh'.

Although the main station building appeared relatively untouched, David was careful not to rely on contemporary photography alone. He managed to source several Victorian postcards, which revealed some key differences.

David explains: "There was a different arrangement of chimneys and a small bell tower. These details would have been missed had I only relied on recent photographic evidence."

Each building is made out of MDF, plywood and card, plus scrap pieces of wood and metal. Most of the fine detail was scribed directly onto the wood or carved onto a layer of cured plaster – formed from a mixture of adhesive and plaster.







often-overlooked form of research - talking to real people about real experiences!

"Residents of Hadleigh have supplied me with information," says David. "Some played around the station as children. Their memories can only go back so far, but living history is powerful.

"One gentleman – a member of the Gauge O Guild – contacted me after I posted images of the layout online. He was bowled over by the similarities he recognised from his own childhood memories. We've kept in contact and have compiled a collection of research materials over the years."

David also contacted local history group the Hadleigh Society, which was another useful resource.

#### THE BORROWERS

Space restrictions present a challenge in 'OO' and even 'N', but at 1:43 scale, 'O' gauge requires even more discipline. David jokingly refers to this as the

'Jaws effect': "You're gonna need a bigger baseboard!" Space restrictions aside, David chooses to model in 'O' gauge because he enjoys the fine level of detail that can be achieved in 1:43 scale.

"The figures look very realistic in particular," he explains. I couldn't imagine getting that same level of detail in anything smaller. I've used Omen Miniatures and S&D Models' Phoenix Figures range. Some were already painted, others I've enjoyed painting myself."

Since retiring earlier in the year, David has found himself getting more involved in the actual model making of 'Hadleigh'. He explains why: "The realism conveyed by the photographs is staggering. It's got me fired up. I feel I've achieved an intermediate level of accuracy, which I want to improve. I'm going to repaint some of the figures and I'm keen to alter the area outside the station – the colours look a little too uniform to my eye.



### Hadleigh: An historical perspective

#### **Words: David Bousfield**

The Hadleigh branch opened in 1847 and began at Bentley on the Ipswich to Colchester line. The staff-controlled single track ran for seven miles via Capel and Raydon Wood to the terminus at Hadleigh. Although passenger services ceased in 1932, goods traffic continued until 1965.

Useful photographic evidence has been hard to come by, but the station and its surrounding area were captured by an anonymous photographer in September 1911. Whoever it was, he or she took a series of photographs, from the signal

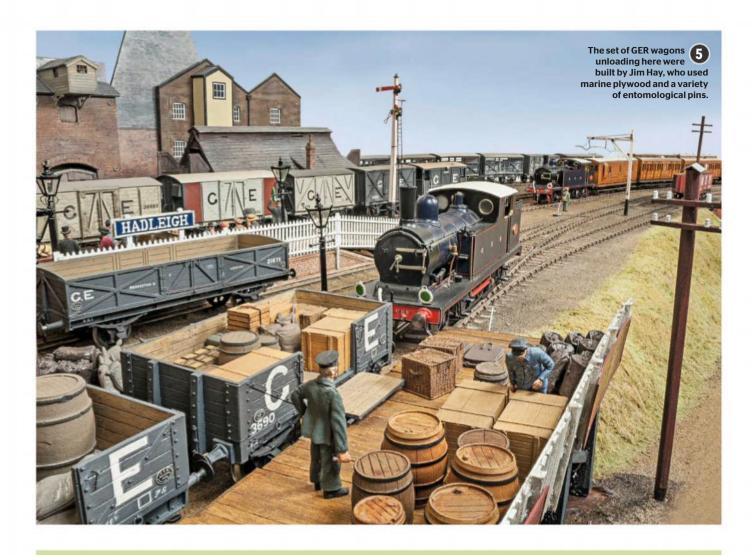
box, past the maltings, coal sidings, engine shed and coal stacks, to the cattle pen next to the terminus headshunt.

One of the photographs is shown here, and the full set is part of the Windwood collection, held at the National Railway Museum. Apart from a solitary tank engine shunting an empty set of cattle wagons, the photographs display a distinct lack of activity. This leads me to believe that they were taken during a weekend.

The only other contemporary photographic evidence I've found comes from a couple of postcards; these earlier sources depict a much busier scene, centred around the arrival of a passenger train.

Interestingly, the track plan has changed very little when compared to older Ordnance Survey maps. However, they do highlight the fact that the coal merchant's staithes were built on a considerable incline - there may even have been a covered NER-style coal drop.

I have tried to model this area, but the lack of information and the truncation of the model's track plan mentioned earlier mean that this is the part of the model that I am least satisfied with at the moment.

Locomotive power is provided by an 'S44' O-4-4T and 'M15' 2-4-2T (their heavy fuel consumption earned them the nickname 'Gobbler'). Purists may query the authenticity of an 'S44' running on 'Hadleigh' as they were mainly used on suburban lines and required condensing gear. However, two of them did make it over to nearby Colchester and Brightlingsea, where they were nicknamed 'Crab' and 'Winkle'.

Both models were built by Wally Mayhew, who I had the great pleasure of meeting in 1984. Wally's locomotives not only look the part, but are reliable and slow runners. The models were painted by Dave Studley and Les Richards respectively.

Coaching stock was initially constructed using Trevor Charlton's etched coach sides and a scratchbuilt chassis, and more recently from D&S etched kits. The distinctive varnished teak finish was courtesy of Dave Studley, who is producing identical finishes to those he produced around 30 years ago!

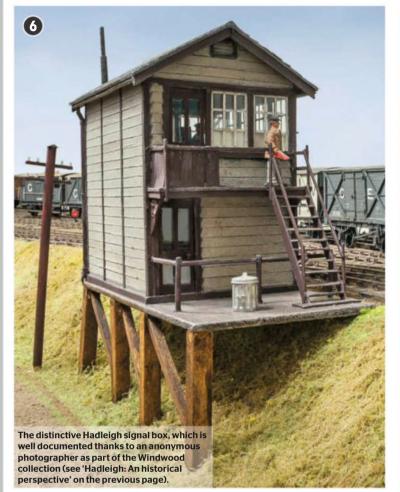
Dave paints most of my stock, which ensures consistency, especially when the liveries of the period are open to such interpretation. I had to research each livery extensively, and it's still difficult to tell just how accurate the



finished product is. The ventilated vans are a good example – many people think they were white, but my sources suggest they were actually a light grey.

Goods wagons come from a wide variety of sources and reflect a somewhat broad example of what might have visited Hadleigh.

Normal freight livery was slate grey.

Some ventilated vans were painted
a lighter shade so that they stood out
when carrying perishables - indicating
they needed to be dealt with swiftly upon
arrival. For more urgent cargo, wagons
were fitted with just Westinghouse (GER
standard air brakes) or dual-fitted with
vacuum brakes so they could be run at
passenger train speeds. Dual-fitting
enabled vans to be run outside the GER
network, which necessitated a further
livery (pictured below).

### RESEARCHERS AND HISTORIANS

Many of us have a favourite aspect of railway model making – even if we don't like to admit it. And yet we so often talk of builders, engineers, designers, collectors and players, but rarely do we talk of researchers and historians.

The tactile nature of a three-dimensional model may garner all of the attention, but it's the research that assures its authenticity. This is of particular importance when building a prototype, but research can be a time-consuming task – particularly when modelling a poorly documented location or era.

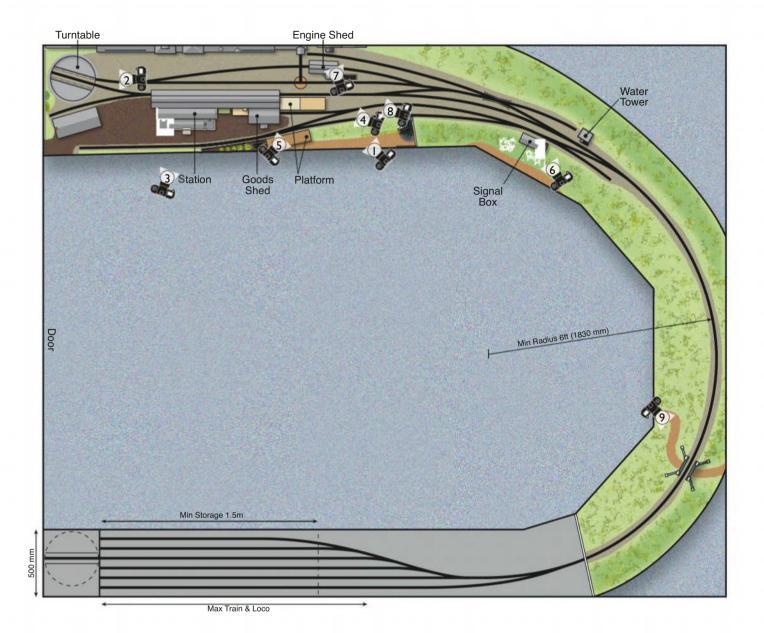
David is the first to admit that 'Hadleigh' wouldn't exist without the help of a roster of hugely talented modellers. But it wouldn't feel nearly as authentic if David hadn't been constantly asking the questions: Who? What? When? Where? And, how? It's simply astounding then that David refers to 'Hadleigh's' current state as 'phase one'... There's a lot more to come from this Victorian-era branch line terminus and the *Model Rail* team cannot wait.

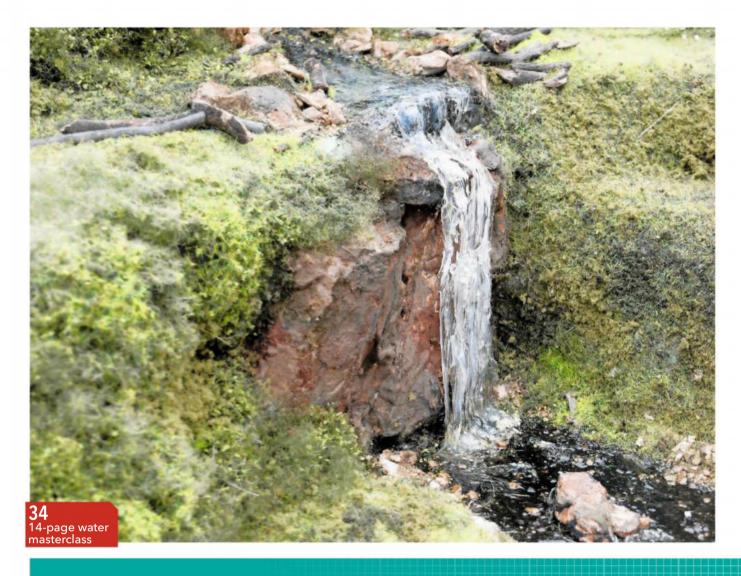

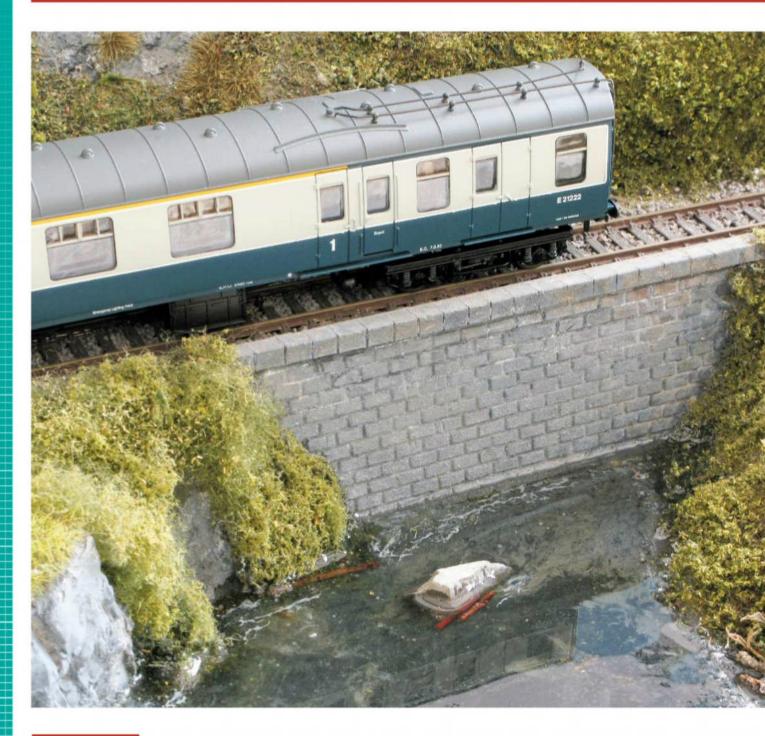

### Thinking about water features

Roadside puddle or Dawlish sea wall; here are some thoughts on making a great-looking water feature. Water can lie on roadsides, in farmers' fields and even in troughs to feed livestock. Residential houses sometimes have garden ponds, fountains, water tubs for allotments and swimming pools.

Streams vary in size from a trickle to a gushing torrent as the volume varies with the seasons, while water at a lakeside and seashore varies tremendously depending on the location, time of year and time of day. It can be still, or rough with breakers, waves and lots of spray. Some shorelines are rocky, some sandy, others pebbly while others are covered in reeds. There may be sea defences too.

Water colour depends on the depth, flow speed, debris, type of underlying rocks, source (peaty ground, for example, results in treacle-brown water) and the reflection of light. If, for example, a slow-running river is beneath trees in full leaf the water will appear to be a lot darker than an equivalent stream with the same underlying rocks in an open setting.









### 4 top tips for a realistic shore



Above: Rocks and boulders are often found near or in rivers, streams or seashores. These can be bought as modelling products (often known as Talus).

Alternatively, hunt for suitable alternatives in your garden or near a river or seashore.

Below: Tall grasses, waterside plants, weeds, bulrushes and water lilies add to the realism of water locations. These can be made from etched plants, laser-cut card plants, foliage nets, tall grasses, grass tufts and strips, or several layers of static grass.





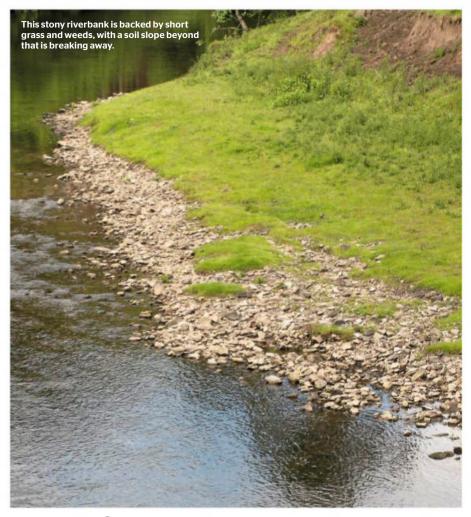
Above: Timber pieces floating in rivers, on the riverbank or along the seashore can be bought either as real wood or as plastic pieces from model suppliers. You could also use small twigs from your garden, or gathered during a walk in the woods.

Below: Boats, canoes, dinghies, sailing boats and canal barges add a further dimension to any water location. These are available in kit form from various firms such as Artitec, Faller and Kibri. Ready-made small boats are available from Noch and Harburn Hobbies.

### Top tips for a stunning water scene

- ◆ Paints for colouring the base of a river, seashore or dock scene can he acrylics, enamels or household emulsion (small match pots cost around £1 each from DIY stores).
- ◆ If the baseboard material is plywood or anything that has a rough surface, skim household plaster over it to even out imperfections before adding the water fluid layers - especially if you intend to model still water. Sand the dried plaster to ensure that the floor of your water feature is smooth.
- ◆ Seal the area to be covered in water before pouring on the water fluid. A thin layer of PVA is good for this. Paint the PVA up the walls or sides of the area to just above the height that you intend to fill with water. The liquid will find leaks in the baseboard and seep out unless it is sealed properly.

◆ Ensure the baseboard is level before pouring on the water, otherwise the fluid will run to the lowest point and leak before it is set, or settle unevenly, which may not be the illusion that you want.

◆ Pour on thin rather than thick layers of water liquid and be patient in allowing each layer to thoroughly dry. Thick layers may

not dry fully, or may dry cloudy. Always read the manufacturers' instructions regarding the maximum depth of the layer of water to be poured at any one time, and follow the drying times stated. Water products always dry more quickly in dry, warm weather.

◆ Leave pouring on the water fluid until it's one of the last jobs on the layout. If poured on too early during the construction process, it might become damaged during subsequent modelling tasks.

- ◆ If the surface of the water becomes marked or loses its shiny look, simply add another coat of the water fluid as part of layout maintenance.
- ♦ If you don't want your water to dry clear, add a little dve to colour it. Check the instructions to see what products are compatible with each other as some resins will only mix with oil-based paints.
- ◆ Clean your tools with hot, soapy water immediately after use, because once the material has dried it is difficult to remove.

### Water lot of tips

#### WHIP UP... **BETTER WATERCOURSES**

- 1 Paint the floor of a stream or river with acrylic or emulsion paints and allow it to dry fully before pouring on the fluid.
- 2 When painting the riverbed, use darker colours in the middle of the river with lighter greys and browns at the edges to create the impression of depth and an uneven riverhed
- **3** After painting the base of the river or stream, fix rocks, boulders, dead branches, junk, etc on the floor as appropriate. Use PVA adhesive to fix them down and let the glue dry fully before pouring on the water product.
- 4 Make rapids around the larger boulders that protrude above the surface of the water.
- 5 Make the riverbank or stream as interesting as possible - add a fisherman, reeds, stones and tall grasses. In real life there is rarely just water flowing through a field - study the prototype to get the best image of what to aim for in miniature.

#### **BAG... BETTER MINIATURE SEAS**

- 1 Work up the beach or sea wall fully before pouring on the water.
- 2 A sea wall can be made from a variety of materials, such as foam walls by Heki and Noch or Wills' plastic sheets.
- 3 Use real sand to represent a sandy shore. Fix it down as you would with ballast - by using diluted PVA with some 'wet water' (a few drops of washing-up liquid in water) to fix shingle or small stones to the baseboard. Build the seashore up in stages, if necessary.
- 4 After painting the base of the sea, fix flotsam and jetsam, such as dead branches and washed up junk, on the sea floor as appropriate. Use PVA adhesive to fix them down and let it dry fully before pouring on the water product. The effect of submerged bits and pieces will look good through the water.
- 5 There is a variety of products available to represent waves from Deluxe Materials, Faller, Green Scene, Noch and Woodland Scenics. The waves can be added after at least one layer of smoother water has been applied and fully dried.
- **6** No seashore would be complete without a few bathers, walkers, dinghies, lilos and other beach paraphernalia - all available from companies such as Langley Models, Noch and Preiser

### **MAKE... LIFELIKE LAKES**

- 1 Will your lake feature still or choppy water? Whichever it is, be sure to use the appropriate product for your desired water effect.
- 2 If the lake is to be modelled with gradually sloping sides, you could, for extra interest, place cattle grazing nearby or taking a drink from the lake.
- 3 By using grass tufts, static grass or grass mats, waterside grasses can be planted to great effect.

# **Best water products**

You can buy ready-mixed fluids, two-part resins that need mixing, water materials that need heating before they become fluid, foil and even ready-made water features. DIY products, such as clear varnish, can be used too.

There are various products ideally suited for still water and canals, whereas others are more suitable for rougher water. Some complement each other and, for example, the products for the smoother water can be laid first and then a water effects product added later to form waves, ripples and waterfalls.

Most of these water-modelling products are designed for use in 'N', 'OO' and 'O' layouts, but there's no reason why they cannot also be used on smaller layouts ('Z') or larger ('G').

Of all the water products available, here's

a guide to what items are best suited to different scenarios.

**Still water:** Woodland Scenics Realistic Water; Noch 2K Wasser-Gel; Faller Premium Natural Water; Deluxe Materials Scenic Water and Solid Water; and Magic Water.

**Rough water:** Deluxe Materials Making Waves; Woodland Scenics Water Effects and E-Z Water.

**Waves:** Woodland Scenics Water Effects; Faller Water Effekt; Noch Water Drops; Deluxe Materials Making Waves; Busch Aqua Model Water.

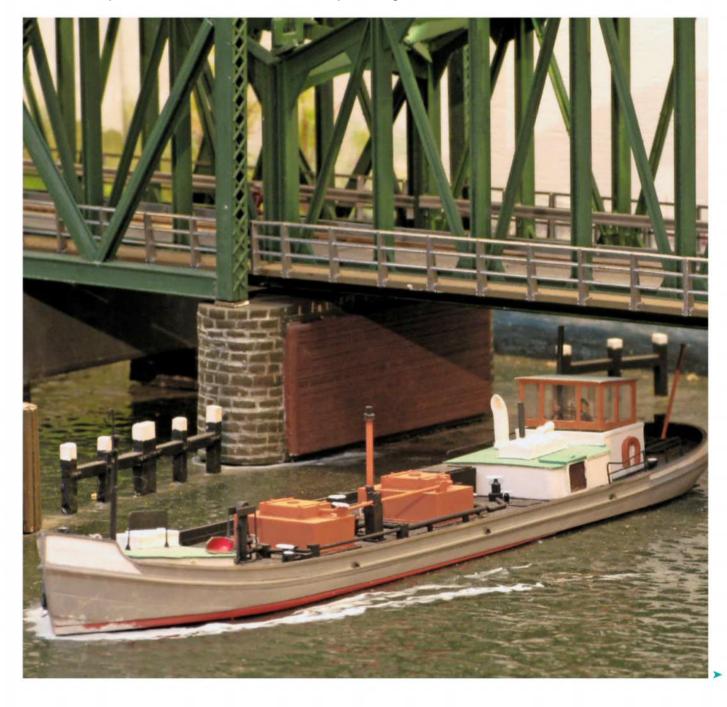
Waterfalls: Deluxe Materials Scenic Fibres and Making Waves; Woodland Scenics Water Effects; Noch Water Effects; Green Scene Easy Water; Faller Premium Water Effect.

**Deep water:** Deluxe Materials Solid Water; Green Scene Deep Water; Magic Water.

# TRIED AND TESTED USING DEEP POUR

Peter puts Woodland Scenics' Deep Pour Water kit through its paces.

oodland Scenics made a splash this year with its complete Water System. Its Realistic Water and Water Effects have been around for a few years, but now the company has launched 20 new complementary products, including undercoats, tints and surface detailing products, forming the most comprehensive range of products to make miniature water scenes of all sizes.

One item caught my eye: Deep Pour Water, which enables you to make deeper water features. Water Tints can be added for visual variety. It dries hard and won't crack, shrink or discolour over time. You can buy either Clear or Murky, depending on what you're modelling, so I decided to give it a try.

I found this kit easy to use and it gave a good, glossy finish once dried. When used with the other products in the Woodlands Water System it enables different types of water features to be built in a number of colour shades and densities.

# Water restoration





Water fluids can be used to rejuvenate old water features, so I used Deep Pour as a restorative tool too. I made this little water feature three years ago, so I poured a layer of Deep Pour over it. It adhered well and the scene was completely revitalised.



After deciding upon the area to be given the water treatment, seal the base with a plaster product, such as Hydrocal by Woodland Scenics. Mix the Hydrocal with water and smooth it on to your scene. Leave to dry.



Deep Pour contains two fluids that require mixing. Use the plastic cups with the included stick-on measuring labels. The mixing ratio is 2 parts Water Base to 1 part Activator.



Place both bottles (tops on) in the plastic bag, seal and place in hot (not boiling) water for 10-15 minutes. Then remove the bottles from the bag and slowly tilt the two bottles back and forth for five seconds or so.



Measure and pour the Water Base into the mixing cup, then pour in the Activator and gently stir. Once mixed, the fluid becomes Deep Pour Water. Working time of the fluid will be around 20 minutes.



To reduce the risk of a film forming on the fluid's surface after stirring, cover it with greaseproof paper and let it stand for five minutes. Uncover and stir for another five minutes. I did this with my first pour of Deep Water and I saw no film or cloudiness at all.



To further seal the base and to add some colour to the scene, use one or more of the new Water Undercoats. Use lighter paints around the edges and darker ones in deeper mid-river sections. Customise colours by mixing two or more of the Water Undercoats.



Deep Water Pour comes as clear or murky, but other shades can be created with Water Tints. These seven different colours can be added to Deep Pour Water and mixed to change the density from translucent to opaque.



The level of transparency depends on the amount of Water Tint and the depth of the Deep Pour. To achieve opacity in the depths and transparency in the shallows, the best formula is one drop of Water Tint added to 30ml of Deep Pour Water poured to a depth of 12.7mm.



Pour the Deep Pour Water into the water feature, starting at the deepest point. It will level by itself. Don't allow air to blow directly onto or near the drying water fluid as this will cause distortion and a dull surface film. Take care not to blow any debris onto it as it dries.



A second layer can be poured when the previous layer becomes sticky (allow about four hours). Gently touch the surface of the water with a toothpick in an inconspicuous area and pull it away. If a string of fluid comes off instead of a drop then it is in the sticky state.



Create a dome with a piece of aluminium foil or greaseproof paper to protect the freshly poured water feature. The air under the dome will warm up as the fluid cures and help in the curing process. Leave for at least four hours.



To add a ripple effect to the water surface after the Deep Pour has dried, use a wooden scalpel to shape Woodland Scenics Water Ripples gel on the surface of a river.



Woodland Scenics White Water Highlight is good for creating frothy peaks in rough water and can simply be dry-brushed on, as I did here.

Woodland Scenics' Water System isn't the only new water product on the market - it's been joined by Noch's Modellwasser. So Peter tested these two - and four other water systems - to find out how they performed head to head. Here are his findings...







# WOODLAND SCENICS DEEP POUR WATER

Sold either as Clear or Murky, this is a two-part product that needs mixing carefully to enable deeper water features to be made. Water Tints can be added to create tonal



variety. Deep Pour Water dries hard and won't crack, is non-shrinking, and shouldn't become discolored over time. A small book of instructions is supplied, along with a label to be added to the mixing pot to ensure the correct quantities are mixed. The plastic bottles of Deep Pour Water and Activator need to be warmed gently in hot water first, then mixed carefully in precise quantities and poured into the feature, beginning at the deepest point.

It's a versatile, readymixed, one-part fluid for making water in varying depths. Layers can be poured on a previously dried laver and, once dried. it carries a good gloss with a still finish if you have removed any bubbles before it dries. The small screw nozzle makes it easy to pour a controlled amount. Leave it to dry fully between coats. Use a wooden stick to burst any bubbles and to drag it to the sides of the water feature.

This ready-mixed, 'pour from the bottle' fluid is designed to be a quick way to make ponds, rivers and streams. It proved easy to work with - pouring straight from the plastic nozzle and being thin enough to pour in a controlled manner into even tight corners. # DAPOL MODELLING WATER

# MAKE A WATERFALL

Of all water features, waterfalls are the most spectacular and eye-catching. There's drama in the way water tumbles down a great fall, and beauty in a rapid procession of smaller ones. Here are two quite different examples using the same product: Woodland Scenics Water Effects.



The starting point for any waterfall: the new, non-stick Woodland Scenics Modelling Tray.



Squeeze the Woodland Scenics Water Effects fluid into lengths on the modelling tray.



The Water Effects dries to form a transparent solid. It peels cleanly from the Modelling Tray.



I made the foundation terrain for this steep, narrow waterfall from Busch Modelling Compound that I'd shaped and allowed to dry.



The rock face was spraypainted grey and now I'm beginning to add the grass.



Woodland Scenics Talus was fixed in place by dribbling white glue over the rocks. Then I left it to dry overnight.



Foliage was added to the steep slope around the waterfall. I used Woodland Scenics Poly Fiber.





The plunge pool at the base of the waterfall was made by squeezing on some one-part Noch Modellwasser. I painted darker colours in the centre of the pool.





A few air bubbles appeared in the pool, so a wooden stick was used to drag the liquid to the side and to pop any bubbles.



Take two lengths of almost-dry Water Effects and place it about halfway down the falls. Using a paintbrush, attach either end with a little milky Water Effects fluid. If it's tacky enough, it should adhere to the Modelling Compound.



Near the base of the waterfall, other pieces of dried Water Effects were added - held in place by Water Effects (here it's still wet, so it's shown as white in this picture).



To create the impression of quickly falling water, streaks of white were added to the waterfall using Woodland Scenics White Earth Colours applied with a paintbrush.



As the fluid dries, add more white streaks to represent foamy, frothy water where the water crashes over the rocks and other debris.



Part of the finished waterfall. You can almost hear water tumbling down the side of the mountain!



This waterfall was wider and shallower. I fixed lengths of dried Water Effects using the same fluid as an adhesive. This keeps the water away from the undercut.



The rock face was made from Woodland Scenics Hydrocal then painted with acrylic paints. Twigs and rocks were scattered around the sides of the river and the waterfall.



The froth around the rock and at the base of the waterfall was made by stippling on white acrylic paint.

The most common water feature on layouts will be some kind of watercourse, such as a stream, river or canal. With this in mind, I set out to make the most realistic river possible. The beauty of these techniques is that you can use them to make any type of waterway, from the bucolic stream to a man-made canal.



To make the riverbanks, I laid sheets of 5mm Woodland Scenics Modelling Sheets onto the baseboard. Fix them in place with some Woodland Scenics Foam Glue.



These sheets are easy to cut and shape with a sharp craft knife. Shape the edge of the foam so that the bank slopes gently down to the river.



Cover the landscape with plaster cloth. Cut small sections, soak and lay onto the foam. Overlay each piece for strength. Leave to dry.



When the cloth is dry, seal the gap between it and the baseboard with Deluxe Materials Create & Shape to prevent water fluid from leaking.



Use Create & Shape to fill any other holes in the plaster cloth. When it's dry, spray Humbrol 80 acrylic where you want grass and 93 where you want soil.



Parts of the landscape were brush-painted with acrylic paints from an art shop. Use darker colours towards the centre to create a sense of depth.



To create a stony riverbank, I applied PVA and sprinkled on some WWS Washed & Dried sand, darkening it with some acrylic paint.



After the paint had dried, I planted the riverside static grass fibres with a Noch Gras-Master 2 in a few minutes.



Your watercourse will need some plants growing along the banks. There's plenty to choose from, including these items from Gaugemaster, Noch and Walters.



These laser-cut bulrushes are fixed to a backing sheet with a couple of small tags that can be cut through with a craft knife. Use tweezers to tease out the leaves.



Because the landscape is a mixture of foam, plaster cloth and filler, making holes in which to plant things is easy. Press a hole through using a Woodland Scenics Foam Nail.



Put a dab of PVA glue into the hole. Then, with tweezers, place the plant into the glue. It will dry clear.



Woodland Scenics' Field Grass is available in various subtle colours and is good for fine rushes and tall grasses along a riverside.

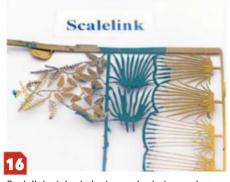


These thicker green fibres from Anita Décor have been cut to size. Make a hole, add glue, and then place the fibres in the hole.

Add some tiny twigs from the garden to the riverbed to represent branches that might have been swept down the river.



Scalelink etched plants need priming and painting and are available from some model shops and directly from the manufacturer (www.scalelink.co.uk).



Use a small pair of scissors to cut the MiniNatur flowering plants in half. These plants are available in a number of colours and are available directly from www.mininatur.de



Once you've added all the plants and features that will sit in the water, add the water itself. Protect the end of your scene with masking tape or a piece of card.



Pour Deluxe Materials Aqua Magic onto the river bed. Don't worry about covering the entire area and don't apply too much in one go.



Once sufficient Aqua Magic is poured into the riverbed, use a plastic tool to gently push it to the sides.



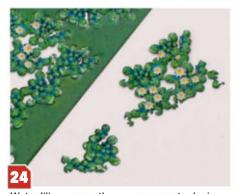
After a few minutes, use the spatula to create some ripples and movement. Study the way real water flows around riverbanks and obstructions in the water.



Leave the first layer to dry overnight. Cover it to prevent dust sticking to it. When dry, apply another layer of fluid. Yes, it takes time, but the results will be worth it. Leave to dry.



With your water at its desired depth and fully dried, you can add more detail using PVA. Woodland Scenics' Talus is perfect for waterside rocks and stones.



Water lilies are another common water-loving plant. Laser-cut ones from Noch need to be removed from the backing sheet before use.



Just a couple of dabs of white glue under the lilies will be enough to fix them to a riverbank.



The riverbank was covered with a thin layer of white glue. Fine brown scatter material was sprinkled on top of it while the glue was wet.

# Essential tools

# MODELLING PERFECT WATER

The right tools can make lighter work of a daunting task like modelling water. **Peter Marriott** rounds up the best ones and suggests a few low-cost alternatives.

odelling water is one of those tasks where the right tools make the job so much easier, quicker and will give better results. You don't need expensive power tools either. You can find everything you need to make a water scene for a few pounds from the likes of Squires

(www.squirestools.com), Eileen's Emporium (www.eileensemporium.com), Expo Tools (www.expotools.com), Gaugemaster (www.gaugemaster.com) and Hobby Craft (www.hobbycraft.co.uk). Or you could equip yourself with half the tools by eating a yogurt and a lollipop!



#### **SPATULA**

Don't drag water fluids with paintbrushes or metallic tools. Use little plastic spatulas designed for spreading glue. A pack of ten costs £1.80 from Amazon. Or save ice lolly sticks or wooden coffee stirrers - these will spread water fluids just as well.



#### **PAINTBRUSHES**

It's always recommended to use quality brushes for most modelling tasks, but not in the case of modelling water. The standard of painting doesn't need to be as good as something more visible, so you can get away with older, poorer quality brushes.



#### **SYRINGE**

Syringes are perfect for dispensing a controlled amount of water fluid. Deluxe Materials Pin Point Syringe Kit (£5.95) includes two syringes and three different sized stainless steel tips. Make sure you wash the tips after use. Little plastic pipettes will do the job almost as well, and you can buy a pack of five for 95p from Amazon.



### **PUFFER BOTTLE**

A puffer bottle is a great way to remove dust and debris that will become visible if it's caught in your water fluid. For larger areas, using a vacuum cleaner is recommended. Boots sells an air puffer for just £4.33.



### **PLASTIC BEAKERS**

Two-part resin fluids and dyes need mixing together, and you'll need something to mix them in. Most household or hardware stores will sell suitable beakers. Alternatively you could just recycle an old yogurt pot or takeaway carton for the job.



# WOODLAND SCENICS' MODELLING TRAY

The Woodland Scenics Modelling Tray is ideal for making waterfalls. Just squeeze out lengths of fluid into the tray and leave it to dry. The strips can be easily peeled from the non-stick tray. Costs £20.75 from Bachmann stockists.

# MAKE MINIATURE HYDRANGEAS

For the ultimate in scenic authenticity, how about making miniature hydrangeas... out of actual hydrangeas? Reader **Steve Nall** reveals his method.

always thought that the pruned hydrangea heads from our garden looked like miniature trees. So when I first started making scenery, I had an idea. I dried some out and thickened the stems with plaster to make a trunk. Then I sprayed them, covered them in flock and left them to dry out.

The result was something that looked vaguely tree-like but didn't actually resemble a real tree in any real sense. Oh well, we live and learn...

But my interest in hydrangeas was piqued again when my wife received a bouquet of



flowers, which included a brilliant lime green miniature variety. These *Hydrangea paniculata*, or 'Little Limes', have such an interesting shape. They reminded me of Cornish hydrangeas - the bright blue and pink flowers with vivid green leaves that you find along the road sides.

Could they be used on my layout? When the bouquet started to droop, it was time to make my move and find out.





I removed the heads, leaving a bit of stalk attached, and left them to dry for a week. I turned them carefully every few days and eventually they shrank to just a couple of centimetres wide.



After another ten days they had shrunk even further, and had dried out completely into very delicate and random shapes. I sprayed them with some acrylic green paint using a Sainsbury's plastic spray bottle.



Leave overnight to dry. Don't worry about painting the stems, but leave a bit of stem attached to hold while you're painting. Paint them individually so they all have slightly different shades.



I bought a tub of Battlefields snow and poured various shades of oil paint into it. It absorbed the paint perfectly and dried into clumps over a few days. I stirred it regularly, until a few days later it was in coarse granules, like gravel.



I sifted out any powdered material from the purple 'gravel'. I then drilled holes in a plastic cup and used this to 'grade' the remaining material. Stick each head on separately with PVA, distributing the flower heads evenly.



Finished! For purple hydrangeas, chop some Coarse Purple Flower Flock (FP392) from Model Scenery Supplies (www. modelscenerysupplies.co.uk) and fix it to the dried plants using extra hold hairspray.

# The real thing

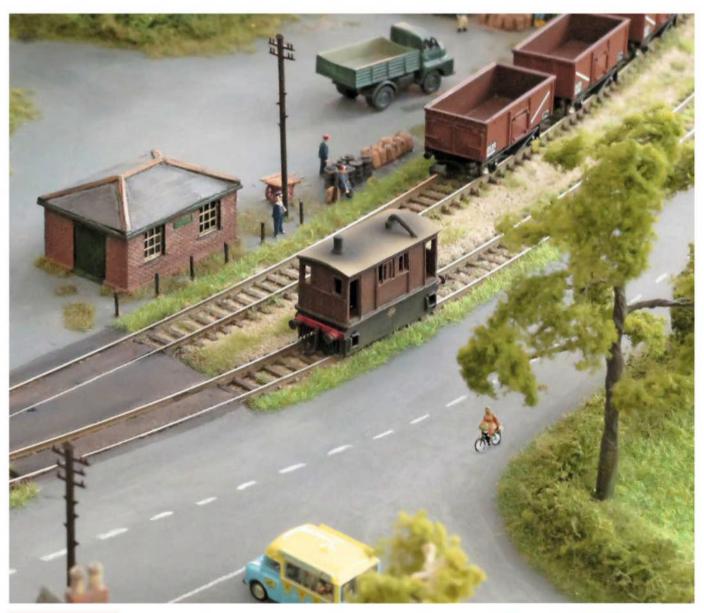
As the modelling progressed in my studio, I kept an eye on the real things in our garden, which started to bloom around the end of May/early June. I've learnt that the vast majority of hydrangeas are planted deliberately, so that meant that my miniature versions would be best suited on the side of roads and in gardens, rather than the trackside. I had a test scenic section all ready, complete with a few inches of countryside, fencing and road.

# ADD THE FINAL DETAILS

Now for the fun bit - **Peter Marriott** wraps up his 'N' gauge layout project by putting the 'cherry on the cake' - choosing and adding the final details.

've got to that point with my Wisbech & Upwell Tramway diorama that is the most fun with any layout: adding the small details.

Fun it might be, but there are pitfalls to catch out the unwary. There are so many detailing products available that it's tempting to cram your layout full of them. But don't - let your layout's location and

time period dictate what you include.

The N-Drive Productions 'Y6' 0-4-OT in BR livery dates the layout to the 1948-1952 period, when this area of the Fens was in transition. Cars and lorries were becoming more prevalent on the roads, but most people still walked or used bicycles. It was – in fact still is – a hugely rural area, dominated by farming. Again, at this time, the internal combustion

engine was beginning to have an impact on railways, but steam power was still king.

There will be very few stretches of railway or areas of the country not recorded in historical photographs. Track down books and local newspapers, or visit libraries so that you can get a feel of what the countryside and the people looked like in the time period you're modelling.

# THE BICYCLES

Bicycles regularly appear in photographs of the Wisbech & Upwell, so I had to include some on the layout. There's quite a choice, even in 'N', from P&D Marsh, Peco and Noch, which come with cyclist figures. Bicyc-LED 'N' gauge bicycles come ready-painted, with miniate LED lighting. They're availage.

ready-painted, with miniature LED lighting. They're available from Morris Models of North Lancing (www.morris-models.co.uk).





This pack of three 'N' gauge bikes comes from Noch. While the colours of the clothes and the bikes look a bit too modern for early 1950s W&U, they come ready-painted and complete with riders.



Installing a bike on your layout is easy. If you want it to be permanent, fix it to the layout with a drop of PVA. If you want to move your bike later, use Woodland Scenics Scenic Accents or Deluxe Materials Tacky Wax.



This Noch figure looked a bit too bright on its 1950s bike. I applied Humbrol AVO207 Sand Wash with a fine brush to tone down the colours.

# SACKS AND OIL DRUMS

The railway was a lifeline for many communities, and a lot of activity centred around it. Corners of goods yards and depots were full of cans, pallets, boxes and barrels, sometimes loaded, sometimes empty. Again, use these items sparingly - don't cover your layout with piles of barrels. Photographic reference will enable you to get the right look. There are lots of suppliers of these types of accessories, but I used Ratio's pack (221) of unpainted pallets, sacks and barrels.





Some items can be left self-coloured, but others will require painting.



Ratio's pack 221 contains all the barrels and sacks you'll need. It's good value too (rrp £3.75).



Remove the parts from the sprue and tidy the mouldings with abrasives.



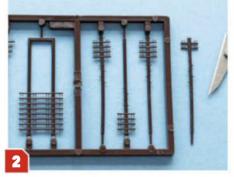
Apply a drop of a suitable adhesive, position the parts with tweezers and allow to dry.

# **TELEGRAPH POLES**

Up and down, up and down... watching the telegraph wires swoop and rise from a train window is a thing of the past, but they were a common sight alongside many railways. I thought they were an important detail, and would help set the layout's time period. You can buy them in 'N' gauge from Kestrel or Ratio and I used the latter, purely because they were next to the pack of barrels and pallets in my local model shop!



The Ratio pack (211, rrp £4.00) of telegraph poles moulded in brown plastic comes with ten poles. They can be modified to suit your layout.



I used a Swann-Morton knife to cut some of the arms from the telegraph poles. Then I cleaned the pole up using a small file.

I made a hole in the baseboard with a small drill then pushed the pole into the hole and fixed it with a dab of PVA glue. Then I pushed the pole into the hole and affixed it with PVA.

# Road vehicles

The choice of vehicles in 1:148 scale is not huge. Oxford Diecast has the most extensive range, comprising well crafted die-cast cars, lorries and buses. At the other end of the spectrum there are still lots of somewhat crude metal kits knocking about. In between the two are Osborn's Models' range of 3D-printed vehicles.

I chose two vehicles from the Osborn's range that seemed perfect for 1950s East Anglia: the Bedford S Type lorry and an Aveling & Porter steamroller. They're reasonably priced (the roller cost me just £15.95) and they can be offered ready-painted. They neatly complemented a couple

of cars and light commercial vehicles from Oxford.

Typical of the vehicles that would kill the W&U, this Bedford S Type lorry rumbles along the A1101 towards Upwell.

Trundling along quiet roads in East Anglia, this 3D-printed Aveling & Porter steamroller makes a distinctive sight.

Always try to ensure that your road vehicles match the time period of your layout. I couldn't resist this Oxford Diecast Bedford CA ice cream van. Launched in 1952, the first Bedford CAs appeared just as the final 'Y6s' were being withdrawn.



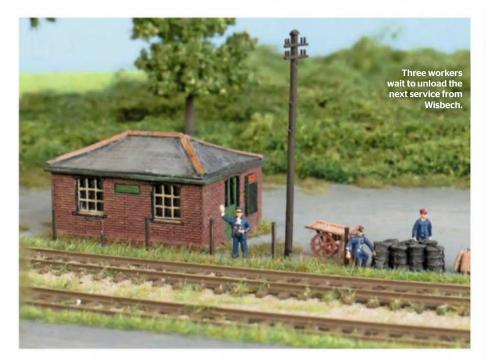


# THE HANDBARROW

There would usually be some device to help people move heavy items, such as the crates and barrels already discussed, and the most common was the handbarrow. I wanted one for my little goods depot, but didn't want to spend time assembling what would be a very fiddly kit.

Instead I opted for modern technology, in the form of one of Noch's 3D Minis, the brand the German manufacturer has chosen for its range of 3D-printed accessories. They're more expensive than a kit (this one, part number 13920, cost £10.50) but they come fully finished and don't require painting. The finish isn't as smooth as injection-moulded plastic, but it isn't hugely noticeable when viewed from normal distances.





# **FIGURES**

This is one of the trickiest areas to get right. You need people to inject life into a layout, because they create points of interest for the viewer. However, it's very easy to spoil your scenery with incorrectly or clumsily placed figures. This isn't helped in smaller scales by the slightly toy-like finish on figures in these scales.

Here are some guidelines I try to follow to get the best out of miniature people:

- 1. If you're planning a group of figures, try to get them to look as though they're talking to each other.
- 2. Try to give individual figures a sense of character.
- 3. There is a lot of choice, go for the best figures you can afford.
- 4. The real world may be overpopulated,

- layout. Fewer figures will maintain the illusion of space.
- 5. Even ready-painted figures can be improved by highlighting their details. A small paintbrush is needed to pick out the details on the figures.
- 6. A thin wash of black acrylic paint on finished figures removes their glossy appearance and also highlights some of the details. A wide (but still small) paintbrush is useful for applying the wash to the figures.

You can fix miniature figures in place with PVA or contact adhesive if you want them to stay in place, whereas Deluxe Materials Tacky Wax or Woodland Scenics Scenic Accents glue is perfect if you want to reposition them at a later date.







Noch produce various packs of 'N' gauge children. This little cameo scene of two children playing with a goose adds a little extra life to the layout.



# Buildinas

Assembling a building kit can be a really fun process, but it takes time to get a building to look realistic. Off-theshelf resin buildings are a boon to the time-starved modeller because they do not require painting or assembly. I repurposed Bachmann Scenecraft's Crossing Keeper's Cottage (42-190) as a small rural cottage.

But I didn't avoid kits altogether. I built the little goods office using a laser-cut plywood kit from Osborn's Models.

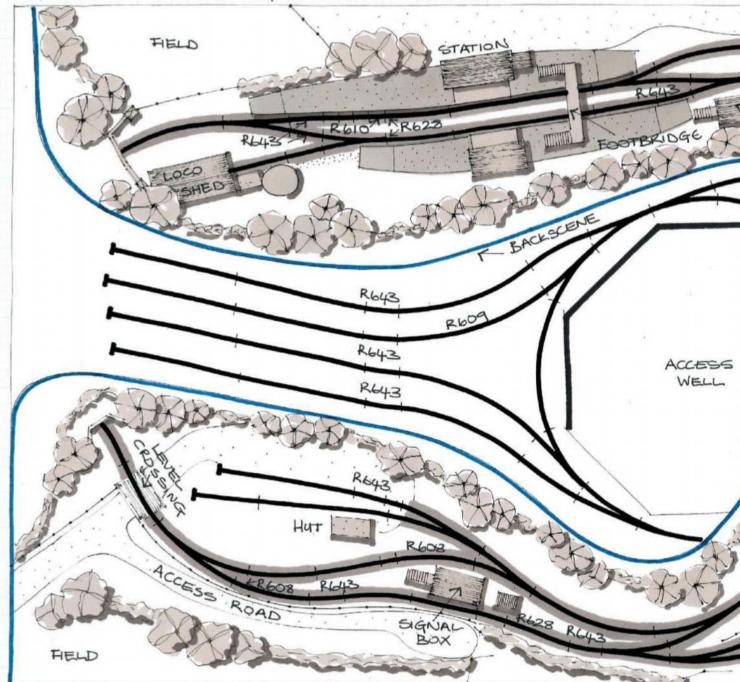
I found that Osborn's Models was a great one-stop supplier for all the bits and pieces and, in addition, they produce good quality road vehicles, accessories and buildings which did not exist a few years ago.

I would like to see smaller, more realistic couplings on 'N' gauge rolling stock in general, and I'm sure that finer scale track will become more common in the future.

# FAST TRACK to authenticity

Paul A. Lunn offers some thoughts on how to get the best from sectional track.

# AN UNUSUAL FORMATION

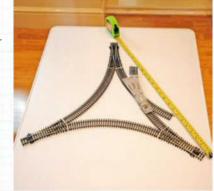
I used sectional track to form this unusual triangular junction. It uses two first radius curves and a few pieces of larger radius curves, either side of the straight point, and it measures 2ft overall, in any direction. Using short stock it's possible to get the whole thing on a reasonably sized table, even allowing for a Peco Loco Lift cassette at each end. The layout and table could easily be crated up when not in use. Please note: one side of the triangle will need to be electrically sectioned for DC to avoid a conflict in polarity.

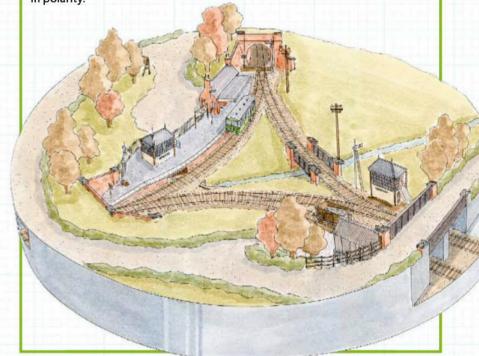

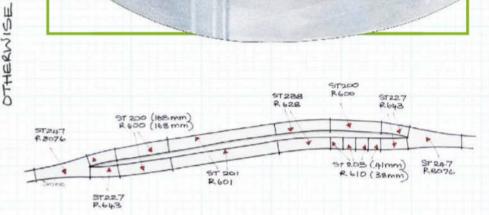

y layout designs vary from the most basic to the considerably advanced, and all points in between. The design above makes use of sectional track components, but includes most of the factors I try to incorporate into any design. I've also tried to improve the realism by:

- Having nothing parallel to a baseboard edge.
- Including a more prototypical space between parallel tracks through the station.
- Planning a deliberately wide gap, in

which you could place a signal box.

- Avoiding the use of a perfect quarter-circle on each corner: top left is slightly straightened out, top right turns away from the norm as it enters the tunnel, bottom left is more than a quarter circle and dog-legs into the upper 'Y' point, and finally bottom right, hidden by a tunnel.
- Maximise operational flexibility Sectional track is the easiest way into the hobby, regardless of what scale you choose to model in. You can use it to make almost any track configuration

and know that your trains will run on it. That said, it does have limitations. The 'six foot', the gap between the tracks, is too wide and not all point/turnout configurations are available off-the-shelf.

Over the next six pages, you'll see how thinking differently about sectional track – and how to go about modifying it – can yield some impressive results. For the record, all Peco codes refer to 'OO' gauge items. But don't worry – you can use these theories with Hornby products or items in different scales.

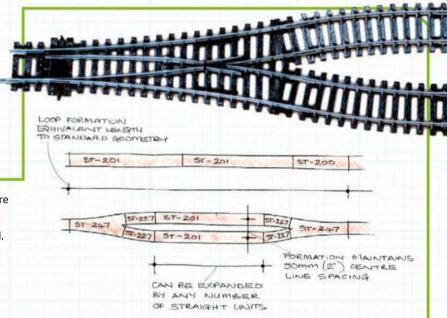

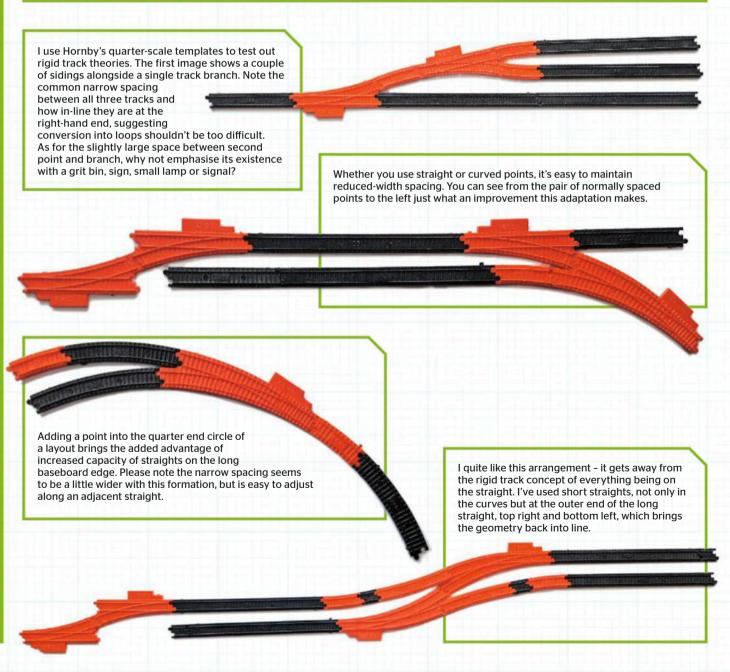
# REDUCE THE GAP

By accident, I stumbled across a method of connecting rigid geometry track, the sort sold by Peco, Bachmann, Hornby and some European and North American companies, but in a way not described in their catalogues. It's a valuable concept for those who are on tight budgets or lack the skill to use flexible track, and it results in imaginative layout design and a superior look, particularly in terms of track spacing. Here's how to do it:

Let's start by reducing the gap between two or more parallel tracks. Here's a standard 'Y' point, ST-247, with short curves ST-227 on both forks. Follow on with straight track in parallel, for as far as you need, then mirror it at the other end, creating a loop.

Note that spacing between double track is now approximately 50mm (approximately 2in) centres, similar to flexible systems. In terms of application, this arrangement would be ideal for a single track with a passing loop.





# APPROACH TO CURVES

It's all very well bringing the track closer together on the straight sections, but the beauty of sectional track is that a first radius curve fits inside a second, which fits inside a third, and so on. What this means is that you can run double track curves safe in the knowledge that trains won't hit each other as they go around them.

Such curves are unprototypical, but they're a must on most layouts as you leave the scenic section and curve around to the fiddleyard.

So, presumably, all is lost when you bring the straight sections closer together? Not necessarily.

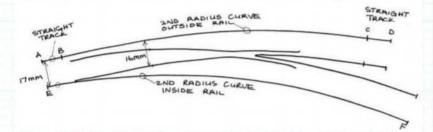
The diagrams show that by introducing a small kink into one of the straight tracks, the sectional geometry on the curves works again. Some of the track arrangements I've described above will leave the tracks well out of alignment.

Does this mean that your only option is to cut custom lengths of track to fill the gap in order to have everything line up again? No. With trial and error you can combine straight sections of different length so that the alignment is restored.

#### **CURVED POINT CONUNDRUM**

With Peco Setrack and Hornby's equivalents, the makers have devised a simple manipulation of their track systems, and while using largely second radius track, indicated with a '2' on this diagram, the use of the short straight, top right and straight parts of a curved point, they've managed to create an outer curve equal to third radius.

If you look carefully at the drawing below, traced from a real Hornby point, you'll see how my previous comments bear out. A. to B. and C. to D. are straight, with the section between more or less second radius. The lower curve is second radius in its entirety. This all appears to be fine, but it's now obvious that there's an inherent problem. The straight point blade is, well, straight as you'd expect, but the rail it's paired with isn't - it curves inwards. As a result, at the toe end, rails have an approximate inside measurement of 17mm, and by the time you get to the right-hand end of the point blades this has become 16mm. Have a look at the drawing and you'll see what I mean.



#### **TOP TIP**

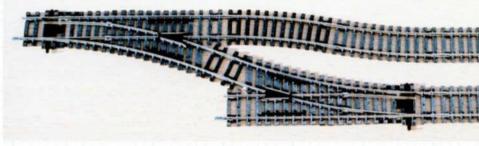
Every layout design goes through a huge number of revisions. Sometimes the sketchpad start to wear a bit thin with all the revisions, and often you don't want to have to sketch it out all over again, having

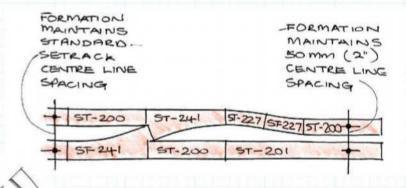
devoted so much time to its development.

from scratch, a tracing can save considerable time and effort. Many artists use a light box in order to trace from one piece of paper onto another. Unfortunately they're expensive to buy and cumbersome to store.

Save your money and use low-tack

masking tape to hold your original at a height that suits your drawing arm position.
Place a new sheet on top of your original, tape it in place and start to trace - it's that simple. The only drawback is it only works in good daylight.





## 'Y' YOU SHOULD!

I've always thought of the 'Y' as the most graceful of all points. It's easy on the eye and gentle on rolling stock - both prototype and model alike.

Most will be surprised to learn that Peco's Setrack 'Y' point radii is a tad under 34in, whereas a standard left-hand and right-hand point is 171/4in. Even a Streamline short 'Y' is 24in. The accompanying photograph shows a 'Y' point that I installed on my son's layout to replace a troublesome curved right-hand point. It shows the 'Y' point as part of an overall second radius curve.



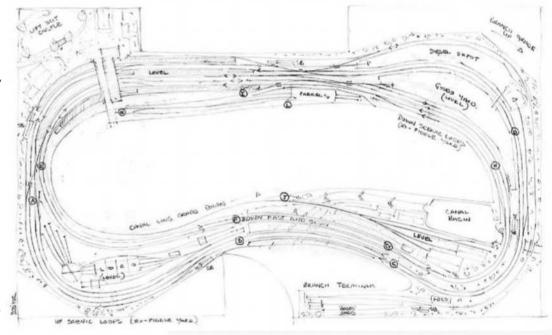
# WHAT'S THE POINT?

This design began as a variety of schematic layouts, based on certain needs and requirements. Ultimately I came up with a schematic plan, followed by a more detailed version to show the design in greater detail, which comprised:

- Through main line routes.
- A substantial junction.
- Two scenic, hands-off, four-track fiddleyards.
- Key operational features steam shed, diesel depot, goods yard, major station with parcels depot, passenger and canal branch lines.
- Key scenic features castle, town centre, two double-track viaducts, canal basin and locks.

When I plan a large layout like this, I don't worry initially about the accuracy of pointwork. Instead I just try to get a feel for the flow and how things might work overall. Once I'm happy with the result, I go back over each intensive track section and design the potential arrangement as a schematic, but in much greater detail. At this stage, I'm always aware of the need to do the following:

■ Focus on large radius points for graceful main line

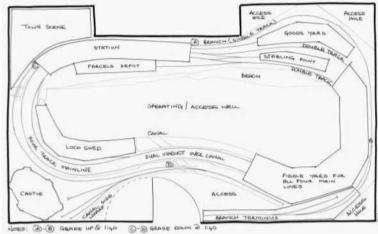

operation, reducing to medium and small points where short wheelbase stock is used, or in tight spaces where needs must.

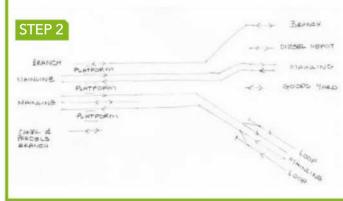
- Always aim to get a train from one place to another in the least number of moves, unless you want to complicate matters!
- Always try to be as railway-like as possible, but be mindful that sometimes it's best to prioritise operational viability over track fidelity.

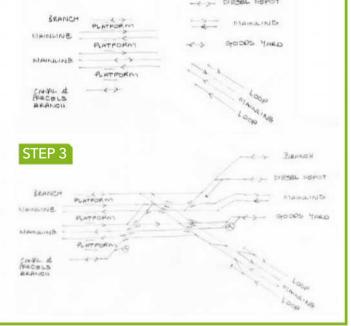
Let's look at this in action:



#### PLAN YOUR POINTWORK

In this most complex area, start by identifying all inbound/outbound tracks and platforms and label them accordingly to avoid confusion (Step 1). Then lay in key routes (Step 2) and finish with all connecting tracks (Step 3). Trace all the routes with your finger and you'll see there's access to and from just about every line. For example, a diesel leaving the depot can access all platform roads, including the passenger branch, a single bi-directional track through the station without platform, and the parcels depot and canal branch. Please note: arrows indicate direction of travel, 'T' denotes a trap point and short curved lines, either single or double slips.

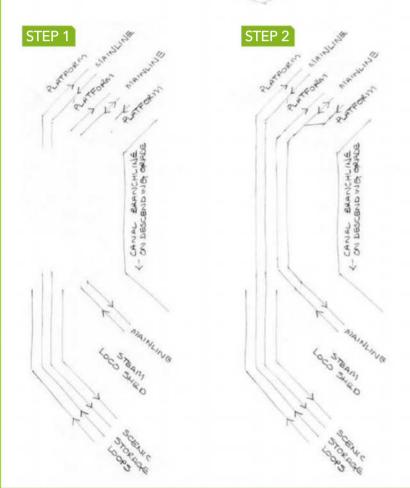
# **SAVING SPACE**

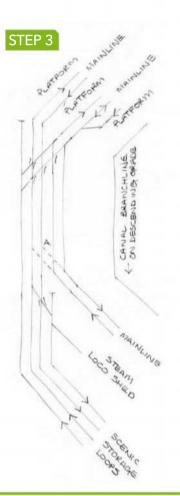
With much less room available at this end I'm considering some space-saving ploys reduce the radii into the station and between the canal line and steam locomotive shed, providing opportunity for extra diverging trackwork. I'm pretty certain the hoped-for crossings, (the hatched lines at A in Step 3) may have to go, but I'll keep them there until the bitter end, while I try to figure out a solution.

l've avoided initial stages for this detail, preferring instead to focus on the end result. Four scenic loops are arranged for through trains or for end-to-end working, and while the train shed purposely avoids detail, I've included the best general working arrangement; four access routes, two to each main line with multi-directional running and shed bypass roads either side.

#### **WORTH THINKING ABOUT?**

We all know that 'OO' gauge track is compromised. Using 16.5mm results in a prototype track gauge of 4ft 6in, rather than the real railway's 4ft 8½in. This is nothing new, and most 'OO' modellers have given up debating it, or moved to 'EM' and 'P4'.

But here's something worth thinking about. If we've reduced the 'four foot', the gap between the running rails, shouldn't the gaps between the tracks, the 'six foot', be reduced too?

For rigid geometry, the gap on Hornby and Peco track is 48mm. Peco Streamline's gap is 32mm, which

scales to 8ft. It should be 24mm. If you work out the relationship between 4ft 6in and 4ft  $8\frac{1}{2}$ in, the difference is roughly  $\frac{1}{18}$ in. Apply this to the 'six foot' and that 24mm reduces to 23mm. Even with this spacing there's bags of clearance on the straight.

Why not go further and reduce the gap to 22mm? This would create sleeker lines and the illusion of increased baseboard length. This would be my choice, and if you decide it's right for you then remember you'll need to increase clearance on all but the very largest of curves and those streamline points will need reducing to facilitate a change in gap.

# WOT, NO DRAMATIC LINES?

No, Paul hasn't given up on the 'Dramatic Lines' series of Masterplan. The next one will appear in MR244, on sale January 18 2018.

# WEATHERING – ALL OR NOTHING?

l've been greatly impressed by George Dent's latest book on weathering. It's certainly given me plenty to think about and I can't wait to try out some of the projects and techniques. I've only recently discovered weathering - or I should say that I've only just realised that there's much more to it than simply laying on lots of 'muck'. My question is, why do we call it 'weathering', as it doesn't really tell the whole story... and where do you draw the line? Surely, if the trains are weathered effectively, shouldn't the buildings, track and even the scenery be treated too?

Nick King, Dudley.

George says: Thanks Nick. I've been something of a weathering evangelist since the early days of my modelling career, yet I've never been entirely happy with the term. Weathering is a somewhat vague description, although I can see the logic behind it. After all, in most cases, we're actively trying to replicate the effects of the outside elements upon an object, building or landscape.

That might be the effects of fading from exposure to sunlight, or streaking brought about by rain washing dirt down from rooftops or splashing upwards from the ground. Other factors, such as exhaust smoke, leaking fuel or oil, the dusty and grimy nature of a location, or whether regular cleaning routines were employed and how effective they were, are also vital considerations.

And yet, when I set out to weather a model, I'm not simply intent on making it look dirty. Weathering is a means of helping an object - be it a train, car, building or even a miniature human being - to blend into its

surroundings. And yes, those surroundings will also need to be weathered to some degree as well. That's why I'm currently working on Weathering for Railway Modellers, Volume 2: Buildings and Scenery!

Adding highlights and shading, gently modulating livery colours to suggest fading, introducing areas of grime, grease and dusty deposits, all play key roles in creating lifelike miniature scenes. Indeed, this is where the term 'weathering' becomes problematic. Funnily enough, an attendee of a recent weathering demonstration that I gave in Manchester (see Backscene, page 146) told me how he preferred to describe weathering as 'increasing realism', which is pretty spot on!

As I see it, it's just as important a juncture in the modelling process as the assembly and painting stages. In fact, I now treat weathering as another part of the painting sequence, especially when building a kit or re-finishing an item of rolling stock. In this way, a plan for the

model's final appearance is decided upon from the beginning. Instead of going through the rigmarole of creating a complete, pristine finish prior to weathering, the 'increasing realism' processes are introduced earlier.

Such an approach has only been adopted wholesale in the past few years, but it proved something of a Damascene moment. Not only has the quality of my work increased, but my output has speeded up too. More than that though, it has proved much more enjoyable.









# Easy way to gritty realism



Creating a textured finish on plastic, metal or resin buildings is simple. Just add a little talcum powder or dry weathering powders to acrylic paint and brush onto the primed surface. You can add as much talc or powder as you like, although the paint will thicken accordingly and thinning may be required.

Acrylic paints work best with this technique and, after the initial 'texturising' coat has dried completely, a more accurate shade can be built up by hand, airbrush or aerosol, using acrylics or enamels.

Further weathering will then highlight this gritty texture.

# Light up a cyclist

There's an ever-expanding selection of illuminated layout accessories, each of which can elevate interest and realism, as well as adding an element of fun.

The Bicyc-LED cycle comes as a pre-assembled unit. All you need to do is drill a hole in the baseboard and connect the four wires to a power source.



When connecting to an accessory power supply, such as the 16V AC outlet on a typical controller, both black wires are connected to one terminal and the red/green wires to the other.



Drill a suitable hole in the baseboard that will allow the wires and resistors to pass through, before securing the cycle's wheels with a tiny blob of PVA.



# THE GOOD LIFE IN 'N' GAUGE



I was thinking of adding a few allotment plots to my 'N' gauge layout. I've seen a few resin-cast kits, but is there a way of

making them look more realistic, rather than just painting them? Roger Taylor, by e-mail

**George says:** Allotments have come into vogue in recent years. Even the current Labour leader is known as a keen veq-grower!

I've used the Timecast and Harburn Hamlet ranges of cast allotment sections on a number of layouts in recent years. Each looks good when painted and weathered, but they do benefit from the addition of more authentic-looking vegetation.

Taking the Timecast 'N' gauge sets as an example, my preference is to fix them in place and fill any gaps with ready-mixed decorator's filler. This can be brushed on, diluting with water if necessary.

When dry, the castings can be painted with acrylics and weathering washes applied to add greater depth to the textured surfaces.

Tiny tufts of Woodland Scenics foliage are then 'planted' into blobs of PVA glue, placed



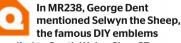
in neat rows and using a variety of green shades to avoid an overly uniform appearance.

Plenty of suitable 'N' gauge gardener figures are available from Langley Models, including the obligatory scarecrow.

#### PROTOTYPE QUESTION OF THE MONTH

My layout depicts a very modern urban setting, so depicting graffiti is a necessary evil. I've managed to recreate basic,

daubed 'tags' here and there with fine ink pens, but how can I recreate the more complex designs, and which types of rolling stock are more prone to this form of vandalism? Mick Quinn, Coventry

**George says:** Alas, these days anything that sits still for more than a day or two is likely to receive the attention of 'urban artists', especially vehicles stabled in out-of-the-way sidings. Freight stock is a prime example, as wagons are usually parked in less secure areas, sometimes laying idle for days at a time. In contrast, passenger stock tends to receive regular cleaning and maintenance in busy station and depot environments.

Waterslide decals offer the best route for depicting modern graffiti. US firm Microscale offers a great 'OO/HO' scale pack that includes some very ornate creations. Furthermore, if you see something particularly interesting, why not photograph it and try printing your own decals onto waterslide transfer paper?

# HOW CAN I RETROFIT BRASS AXLE BEARINGS INTO READY-TO-RUN STOCK?

In order to improve the running qualities of my coaching stock, I'd like to fit brass bearings. Drilling out the axle holes is difficult - is there a special tool available for this job?

S. McMahon, by e-mail

**George says:** Brass top-hat style bearings and high quality wheels **on** pin-point axles make for very smooth and reliable running, reducing friction and extending the life of rolling stock.

With 4mm and 2mm stock, it's difficult to reach between the frames of a chassis or bogie in order to drill suitable mounting holes for the bearings. Indeed, the only previous success I've had in this respect is to drill through the axlebox from the outside, filling the holes once the bearings are in place. This is not an ideal solution by any means...

Knowle Wagon Works appears to have solved the problem with this great tool. It includes a 2mm drill bit (perfect for virtually all 4mm scale bearings) that can be set to the desired cutting depth by means of two tiny grub screws.

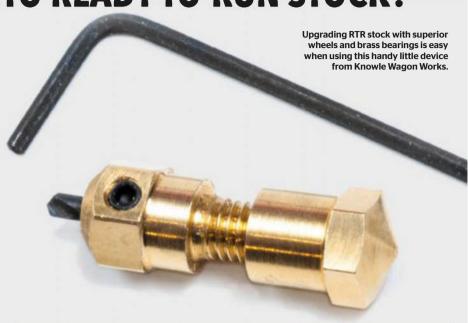
The tool itself is made up of two brass sections, joined with a thread. This allows the housing to expand or contract by simply turning the two ends in opposite directions. The opposite end is chamfered to fit into an existing axle hole.

Operation is simple, with the drill cutting as the tool is rotated gently with finger pressure. The outside of plastic frames need to be supported with the fingers to prevent bowing and the tool is opened out gradually as the drill cuts into the material.

When the drill has reached the pre-set depth, the tool is contracted, removed and the opposite axle hole is treated in the same way. Progress can be swift, although the inside of the frame may need filing back to give adequate clearance for the axles over the new flanged bearings. Full instructions are provided with each tool and a typical 'OO' carriage can be treated in about 30 minutes.

Set the drill to the desired depth, secure the grub screws with the Allen key and slot the tool into the existing axle bearing holes. Twist in a gentle clockwise motion and support the outer frames with your fingers.



As the drill begins to work, the tool can be opened further to maintain the cutting action. Continue until the depth stop activates, close up the tool, swap it over and repeat the process on the opposite side.



Depending on the model, the inside of the frame may need filing slightly to provide enough clearance for the axles and bearings. After test-fitting, secure the bearings with a tiny drop of cyano glue.



Slot the wheels into the bearings, adding a drop of light oil into the bearing cups beforehand to promote quieter running and longer life. Double-check that everything turns freely before re-fitting the bogie.



# **DOUBLE CROSSING ADVICE**



I'm planning on installing a gated level crossing across a twin-track main line. Because the road is narrow, a pair of short gates

will not block both tracks when opened to road traffic. Is this prototypical? And how can I add some extra realism to an off-the-shelf crossing kit? Trevor Roper, via e-mail

**Paul Lunn says:** With traditional level crossings, there are often minor variations of equipment and operation to suit the requirements of specific locations.

These two images show a road crossing beside Fiskerton station, on the Newark-Nottingham line. In this case, only a single, narrow gate is provided on each side. When closed across the double-track railway, the gates block off the station side only, presumably to prevent access to the platform ends. The other side of the crossing is left completely open.

Interesting details to note include the large concrete posts and substantial iron hinges, sagging timber gates, unusually placed red warning targets (at high level rather than central), primitive red lamps and protective wire mesh.

There are also locking lever plates set into the ground to keep the gates secure in the open or closed position. These are linked - and interlocked - with levers in the adjacent signal box.



# Tool of the month

The right tool for the job makes things easier, says **George Dent**.

Cleaning surfaces removes oil, grease and other contaminants from our skin and the atmosphere, all of which can seriously hinder the effectiveness of paints and adhesives.

While a good scrub in soapy water will suffice in many instances, there are times when immersing a model in water is not a good idea, especially when electrical or mechanical parts are involved.



Alcohol-based cleaners are handy in these situations, being effective on dirt and evaporating quickly, leaving surfaces clean and dry.

Iso-propyl alcohol (IPA) is available in different strengths. Weaker formulas, such as Medea's Body Art, is safe for use on painted surfaces, glazing and our skin, while stronger types, such as electrical switch cleaners, are best kept to chassis parts, wheels and gears.

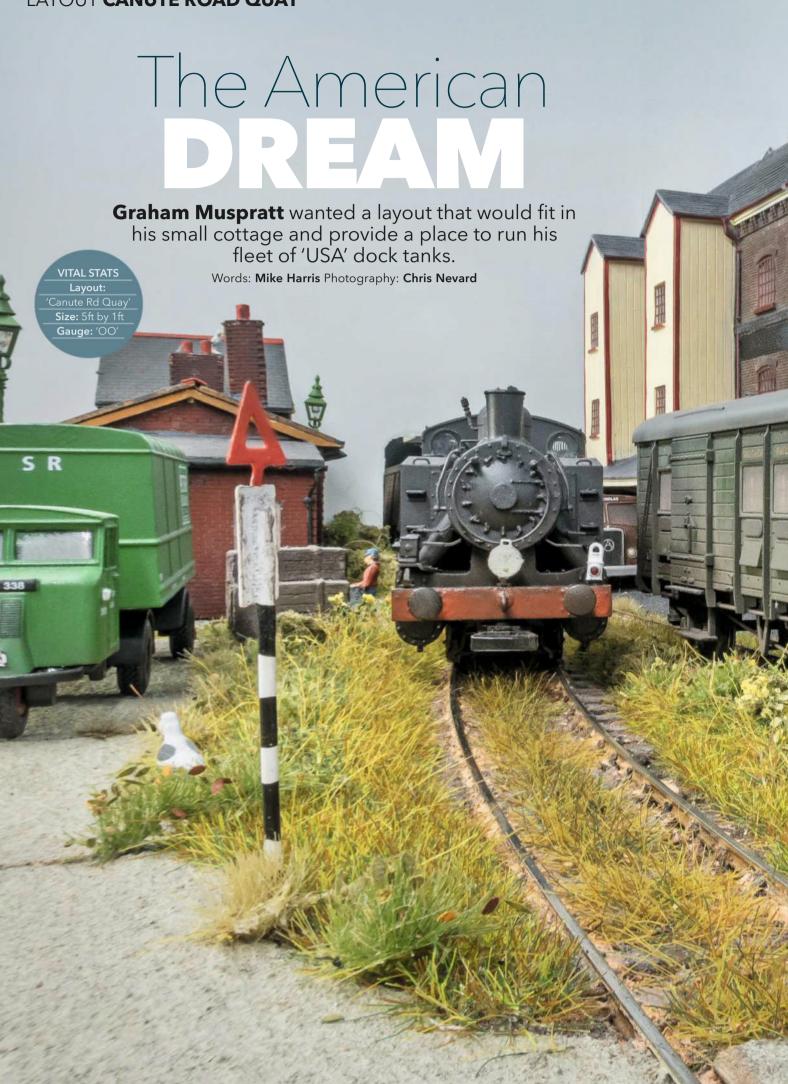

ayouts set within a particular time period or region need to feature specific locomotives and rolling stock to maintain an aura of authenticity. So it can be frustrating when you find yourself lusting over an item of stock that simply doesn't fit your layout.

Sure, there's nothing to stop *Mallard* from visiting your sleepy GWR branch line, but if you're a stickler for realism the whole experience is a bit like eating roast turkey outside of the festive season – it just doesn't feel right! One relatively practical solution is to build a compact layout on which to house your new favourite anomaly. And that's exactly what Graham Muspratt did.

#### **BORN IN THE USA**

Graham is a Southern man at heart and used his extensive knowledge of Southern Railway stock to help with the production of our *Model Rail* Exclusives 'USA' tanks. So it's not surprising that Graham ended up with a trio of dock tanks.

Having already built his stunning Salisbury-inspired steam shed layout 'Fisherton Sarum' (MR189), Graham had two goals in mind: build a more fitting layout for the newly acquired 'USA' tanks, and build a layout small enough so it could be permanently erected within a small space. The result is a fictional representation of Southampton Docks.

"I live in a small cottage," says Graham. "I don't have the space to put my main layout up, so I wanted to build a small shunting puzzle.

"'Canute Road Quay' is only 1ft deep, and the track plan is what the Americans call a 'timesaver shunting puzzle'; it's similar to the British inglenook, but with the addition of a run-round loop."

You'd think that water would be an essential element of a dockside layout, but 'Canute Road Quay' doesn't have any. Yet this is hardly apparent: "I decided that if I included water, there simply wouldn't be enough space for the track plan," Graham explains.

It's a clever and necessary compromise. Everything from the quayside wall, tramway-style trackwork, dockside details and even the presence of *Model Rail*'s exclusive 'USA' dock tanks immediately place the layout at the waterfront. When

# DO IT YOURSELF

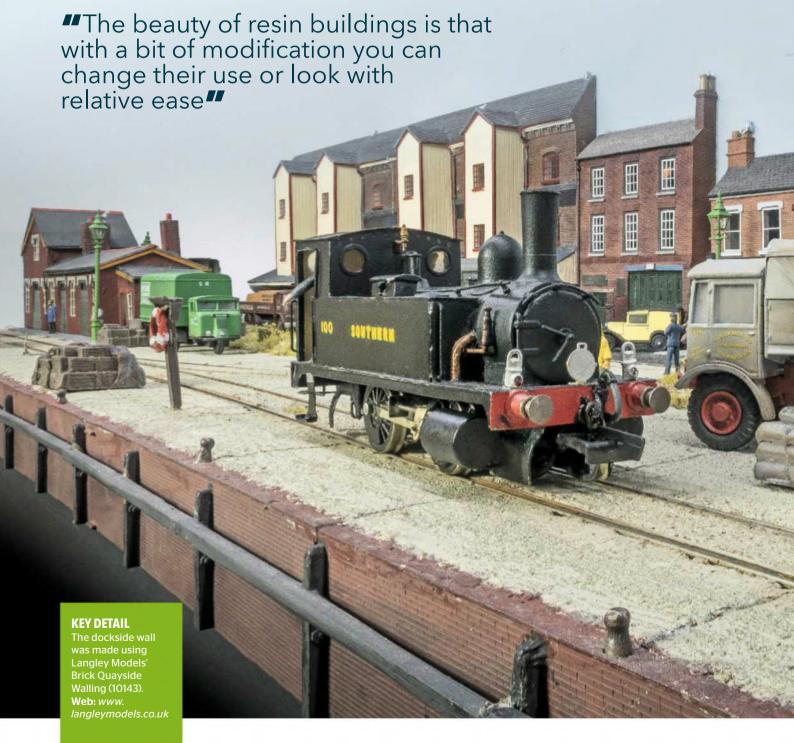
Graham is an advocate of Tim Horn laser-cut baseboards; 'Canute Road Quay' consists of one 4ft by 1ft module, with a 1ft by 1ft module for the fiddleyard. "I went for the slightly more expensive birch ply version," says Graham. "The standard, fit and finish is superb, and you don't have to be an amazing carpenter to put everything together – all you need is a bit of wood glue and some sash cramps. I can't rate these baseboards highly enough."

Baseboard presentation is something that's become more popular of late, with a growing trend for modellers to wow viewers beyond the confines of the scenic section: replica totems, framing and snippets of prototype information are regular occurrences, but Graham has taken this notion one step further. The small 1ft by 1ft fiddleyard is adorned with shelving for the display and safekeeping of idle stock.

"The small fiddleyard module bolts onto the left-hand side of the scenic section and has been adjusted to accommodate a cassette," says Graham. "Like the main baseboard, the fiddleyard module was supplied with three tall sides, which I didn't need. Having removed sections of the sides, I put the offcuts to good use, using them to form shelves."

Once constructed, the baseboards were primed and then finished with a coat of black paint – applied with a roller. On the underside of the baseboards, Graham has outlined a 1:1 scale track plan using black tape. He explains why: "It mirrors the trackwork on the scenic section, which means I can instantly tell which

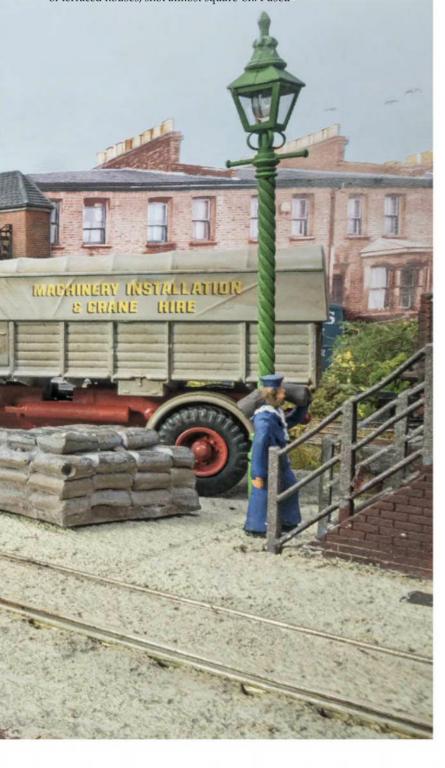
point motor is linked to what point, making maintenance much easier."

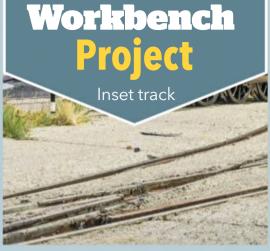
#### **DIGITAL WIZARDRY**

Much of 'Canute Road Quay's' backscene is hidden behind various three-dimensional and low-relief buildings. A photographic sky and row of terraced houses are visible though, and it takes a keen eye to notice that the buildings aren't real.

"Having placed the low-relief buildings, I was left with a gap where the road disappears off to the rest of Southampton Docks – imagined off-scene. My original plan was to find a photograph of suitable warehouse buildings, but trying to find examples from the correct period seemed impossible.

"In the end, I found a black and white photograph of terraced houses, shot almost square-on. I used





Inset track has troubled modellers for decades, and it's something of an essential for anyone wanting to create a dockside. Fortunately, Graham's method of using cork underlay should prove relatively painless.





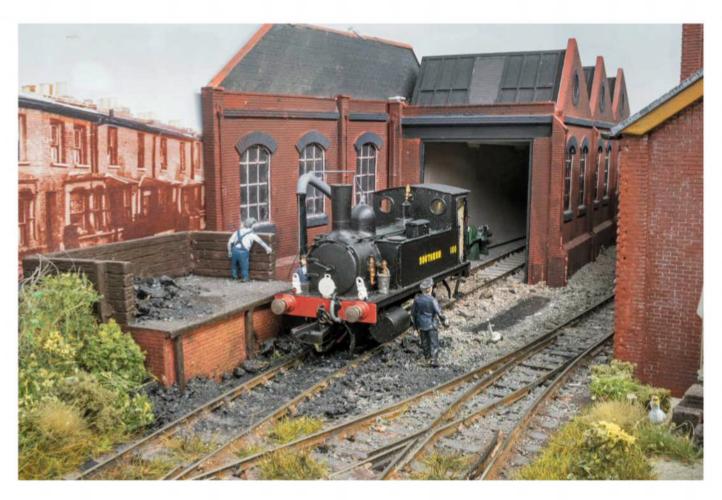
Check rails are positioned within the running rails. They are fashioned from spare lengths of rail and secured using cyanoacrylate glue.



Cork underlay is roughly shaped and laid around the track to raise the ground level to sleeper height. A second, thinner layer is carefully shaped to sit flush against the running and check rails.



The cork surface is painted using Green Scene's Texture Paints, Concrete. Joints were scribed using a screwdriver. The grooves were then passed over with a soft pencil.



computer editing software to colour the roadway and pavement to match said elements on the model."

The result is very convincing – the use of perspective and colour tricks the eye into perceiving a seamless blend between model and photograph.

# EYE FOR DETAIL

Not only is 'Canute Road Quay' packed with tiny details, they've been consistently applied throughout the scenic section. Nothing feels rushed, or as if it's an afterthought. Graham explains how he worked with such discipline: "Micro layouts are often called cameo layouts, and for good reasons. Because of the small size, you can spend time adding lots of little details consistently."

He's gone so far as to include etched manhole covers, drains and even tiny puddles. Such attention to detail has proved a hit at exhibitions: "People at shows often aren't looking at the trains, they're looking at the cameos and details," says Graham.

The large low-relief warehouse on the left side of the layout is actually two Bachmann Scenecraft Bonded Warehouse buildings stuck together (product code 44-204). Before pairing the two structures, Graham removed the steps and platform from each building's frontage. He also modified the building to the right of the warehouse, Bachmann's Local Garage (44-260). "It had a moulded petrol pump on it, which I removed," explains Graham. "I then scribed the brickwork where the pump used to be and repainted the structure. That's the beauty of resin buildings – with a bit of modification you can change their use or look with relative ease."

The Waterloo Tavern building is another Scenecraft addition (44-267) and is based on a real pub in Southampton. Graham hadn't planned to include

a pub, but a friend suggested that a quayside should have a place for the workers to spend their downtime. And besides, the Southern connection was hard to pass up. The office and foreground warehouse are laser-cut card kits from Lcut Creative: "They're modular, so you can mix and match different kits together so they don't look 'off-the-shelf'," says Graham.

# TIME SHIFT

Although set immediately after the Second World War, Graham has been careful not to limit 'Canute Road Quay' to one particular period. "If I wanted to, I could shift the period to the 1950s and 1960s, simply by changing the rolling stock to Sentinels and diesel shunters."

That said, the slightly run-down look of the dock does help to place Graham's preferred post-war period. He explains: "I wanted 'Canute Road Quay' to appear a little run-down. It isn't meant to be a primary dock – its industry is picking itself up after the war."

Weed-covered tracks, added using a static grass applicator, help to convey the run-down feel of the build. "I didn't want the whole layout to feature inset track," Graham explains. "The left side of the layout is more overgrown, but I've tried to represent fresher ballast on the right. I've also placed real coal and ash around the engine shed."

Micro layouts encourage quirkier builds because they don't demand the space, time or money that a larger model railway requires. They're a perfect excuse to get that regional oddity – the one you bought simply because it looked good – running.

Thanks to Tim Horn's easy-to-build DIY baseboard kits, it only took Graham a year to build 'Canute Road Quay'. The result is a delightful, detail-packed shunting puzzle that's small enough to run all year round.



# Historical factfile: SR 'USA' 0-6-0T

The Southern Railway purchased 15 American-built USATC 'S100' 0-6-0Ts in 1946 and 1947. One locomotive was kept for spares, while the remaining 14 proved worthy successors to the Southern Railway's ageing fleet of ex-LSWR 'B4' 0-4-0Ts.

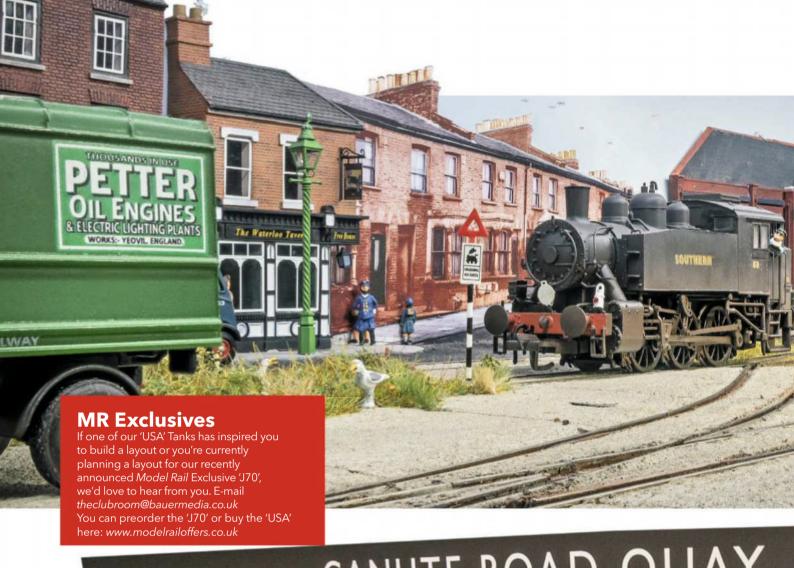
Throughout their service, the 'USA' tanks received various upgrades, including modified coal bunkers and sliding cab side windows. Such modifications were phased in slowly and, consequently, prototype photography often depicts the tank engines at various stages during their evolution. Graham has represented the irregu-

larity of these upgrades by modelling each of his three 'USA' tanks as slightly different variants.

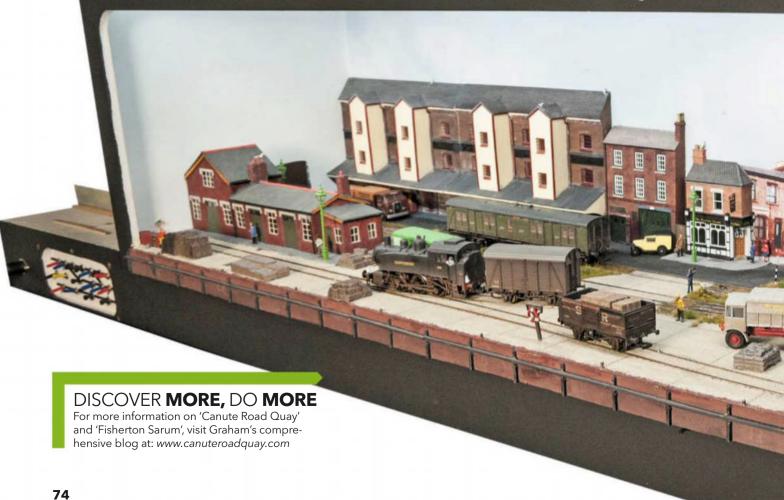
Despite performing well, the introduction of the '07' 0-6-0DE forced some of the fleet into shed piloting duty. Of the remaining locomotives, one was withdrawn and six were allocated for Departmental use. Five 'USA' tanks survived until 1967 - the end of steam on the Southern Region.

Four 'USA' 0-6-0Ts survive in preservation today: No. 30064 at the Bluebell Railway, Nos. 30065 and 30070 at the Kent and East Sussex Railway and No. 30072 at the Ribble Steam Railway.

# **MODELLER CV: GRAHAM MUSPRATT**

I've been model making since I was a child, when I received my first Tri-ang Hornby train set. I built my first locomotive at 14, a Wills Finecast 'Q1' 0-6-0, which still runs today. My Grandfather worked on the Southern Railway and then Southern Region of BR during the 1940s until the late 1960s, which is why I model 1946 to 1949. It's an unusual period, with most SR/Southern Region modellers working within the 1930s or 1950s and 1960s BR periods.

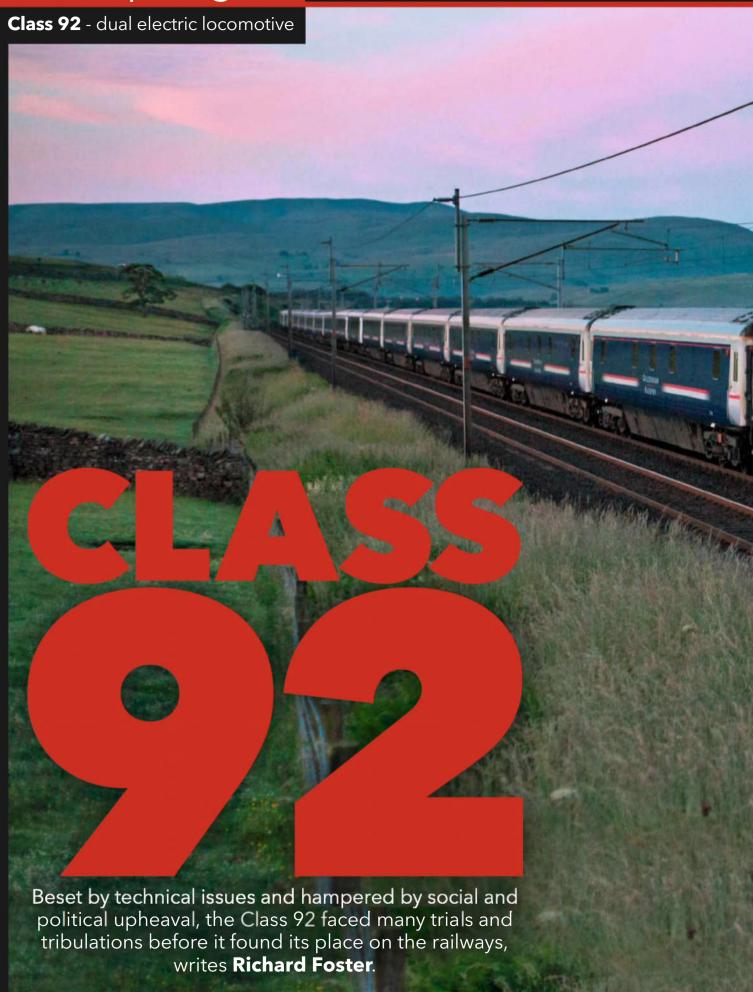
I find the immediate post-war period interesting. I'm a mechanical design engineer by profession, so I find the presence of 'Merchant Navies' and Bulleid 'Pacifics' particularly appealing. My main layout is called 'Fisherton Sarum' (MR189) and is based on Salisbury engine shed. My father grew up in Salisbury, while my grandfather worked on the railway.

'Canute Road Quay' was started just under a year ago. I picked the baseboards up from Tim Horn at the Scale Forum exhibition, and by the Sunday evening I had made the boards, got them painted and was ready to lay track. I can't rate them highly enough.

There were not only technical issues with the locomotive's systems but, more importantly, interference with signalling systems. Testing was protracted, and freight eventually started through the Channel Tunnel in May 1994, but Class 47s handed over to French electrics at Dollands Moor yard, near Folkestone

'92s' started to work revenue-earning freight trains in 1995 and the class started to enter regular service in 1997. But the technical problems weren't over: a software upgrade caused interference with Eurotunnel systems in 2000, and 16 '92s' with the older software were retained purely on Eurotunnel metals.

Political and social change also affected the '92s'. They were introduced against a backdrop of the privatisation of BR. New infrastructure owner Railtrack banned the class from Wembley to Dollands Moor and imposed heavy restrictions on their use, thanks to the previously mentioned signalling interference. New national freight operator EWS wanted to exclude the Class 92s when it bought Railfreight Distribution in 1997.

The rise of cheap air fares to Europe and spiralling costs contributed to the demise of 'Nightstar'. EPS' new operator, London & Continental Railways, lacked the clout to get its new trains running over a fragmented railway, so 'Nightstar' was cancelled in 1999. All 139 coaches were sold to VIA Rail Canada, though only 45 of them were complete. Some were reconfigured, many remain stored, incomplete. They are used mainly on the Halifax-Montreal 'Ocean'.

> The good news is that all 46 Class 92s still survive and the class regularly

work freight through the Channel Tunnel. Modifications have been made to allow the class to work freight on the Channel Tunnel Vienna's Arsenal test centre Rail Link. Sadly, 95% fleet availability and Franco-Scottish through-freights never materialised.

Republic. DB still owns the 30 ordered by Railfreight Distribution, while the

former SNCF and EPS machines are now in the hands of GBRf. However, only seven of DB's '92' fleet is in action in Britain, with all but three having been exported to Eastern Europe.

GBRf divides its fleet between those working cross-Channel freights and those dedicated to the Caledonian Sleeper. Four '92s' regularly provide power for the Anglo-Scottish sleeper, the closest the locomotives have come to the original 'Nightstar' concept.

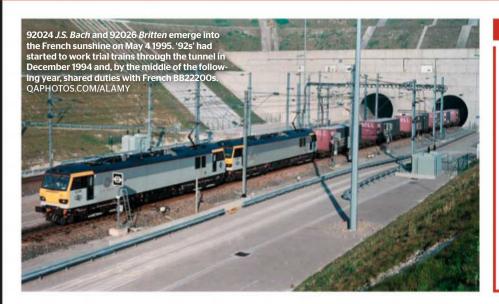

# In model form

Lima just pipped Hornby to the post in the race to produce the first ready-to-run 'OO' gauge Class 92 in 1994. However, the Hornby model, which appeared the following year, has been given a recent mechanism upgrade for its new role in the RailRoad range.

'N' gauge modellers had to rely on the good - but expensive - CJM model until both DJModels and Revolution Trains unveiled schemes to produce 1:148 scale '92s'. Both are still under development (see www.djmodels.co.uk and www.revolutiontrains.com). DJModels is also working on a 'OO' gauge Class 92 to modern specifications.

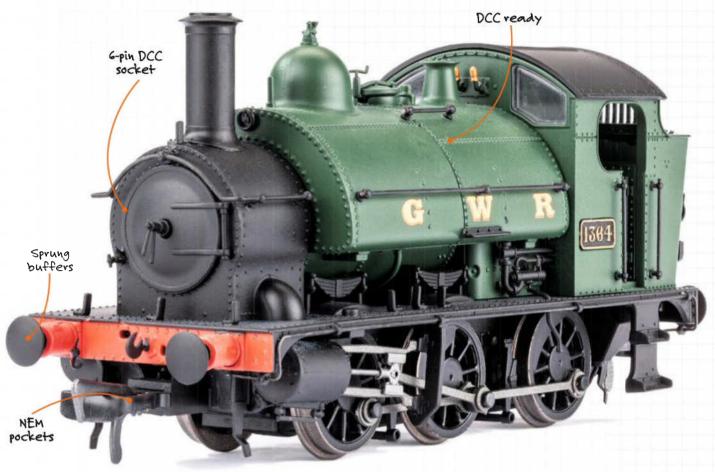

# Kernow GWR '1361' 0-6-0ST

t's funny isn't it? Of all the classes of Great Western Railway locomotives, the 'Kings', the 'Castles' and so on, it's an obscure class of five 0-6-OSTs, introduced in 1910, where we've got duplication, with two manufacturers going head-to-head.

As a result of conceding ground, changes of plan and unforeseen announcements, we have models of the GWR '1361' O-6-OST from both Heljan and Kernow Model Railway Centre. Kernow staked its claim to this prototype first, having conceded to Heljan over the class' successor, the '1366' O-6-OPT. But then Heljan also chose to produce the '1361', and Kernow, with much already invested, decided to press on with its own model.

Heljan's '1361' was good

(MR233), but it left quite a bit to be desired. Now, Kernow's model is here.

The question is, is it better than the Heljan model? Let's find out.

# **REFINED YET ROBUST**

You can tell straight away that Kernow's model has been produced by DJModels.
There's an awful lot of very fine detail but, as with previous DJM offerings, it's surprisingly sturdy.

The 'face', with its distinctive dished smokebox door, looks good, as does the bulk of the saddletank, with its profusion of rivets. All the angles and curves on that quite un-GWR-like cab

and bunker are in the right place too.

There are some particularly fine areas, such as the very slender coupling rods, the tank lifting ring (which looks as though it should move) and the rear cab window protection bars. The latter feature was poorly executed by Heljan.

There's also a commendable amount of daylight

under the boiler.

models, the coal hole to the bunker is also included. And if you think that the lampirons and brackets on the bunker are overscale, they do match images of the real thing.

We received three review samples from a total of six possible models (BR black Nos. 1361 and 1362 and No. 1364 in GWR post-war green). Kernow has clearly done its homework, for although there were few detail variations between the five '1361s', you can see them on the trio of models here. All three have the later, tall chimney. No. 1362 correctly has a toolbox on the fireman's side running plate, while No. 1361, in accordance with the prototype, has handrails on the bunker sides.

# **VISUAL NIGGLES**

There are a couple of little niggles from a visual point of view. Drawings and photographs suggest that the reversing rod shouldn't be quite as angled as it is. There's also a strange protrusion on the tap on top of the dome. It looks as though it could be a moulding pip that, rather than being removed, has been painted as though it's part of the dome.

The safety valve bonnet is moulded flush with a panel on top of the saddle tank. Most photographs suggest that the bonnet should be a separate item, as on other GWR locomotives.

The '1361s' were fitted with steam heating. The mounting holes for the separately fitted pipes are correct on the front, but photographic evidence suggests that the one on the rear bufferbeam is in the wrong place. It should be to the left of the coupling hook and not to the right.

That said, these are minor issues and shouldn't detract from the rest of the model.

The biggest discrepancy is the fact that Kernow's model sports erroneous splashers over

# **Performance**

All three '1361s' were loud and growly straight from the box, and the mechanisms were a little stiff. However, after a little running-in they loosened up a bit. They would probably benefit from a longer running-in session than we were able to give them, which would probably quieten them down too.

Haulage capacity was pretty respectable. No. 1364 managed nine Hornby and Bachmann bogie coaches on level track, but this was accompanied with a lot of slipping; it was much happier with six coaches.

No. 1364 also managed a credible three coaches over our 1-in-60 gradient. However, we're pleased to report that it also managed three over the 1-in-30.

# 66 The cab is a mini work of art, with what looks like a fully detailed firebox backhead 33

the driving wheels. These are not on the prototype, nor are they on Heljan's model. It appears that they've been included to clear the wheel flanges, but they really shouldn't be there. That said, they are quite subtle and it's easy to miss them at first glance.

# HIGH-TECH FEATURES

This being a 'DJModels production', the '1361' also bears some of its technological hallmarks. There are sprung buffers, slim tension lock couplers in NEM pockets and even space for a sound speaker,

for a sound speake albeit a small one. The six-pin DCC socket sits inside the smokebox, which you access by pulling away the door (it's held in place with small magnets).

As with the DJM/Hatton's '14XX',

etched cabside numberplates are fitted. However, the plates are mounted in a small recess, which means that they sit flush with the cab sidesheets rather than standing proud, as per the prototype.

Splashers aside, the model's biggest Achilles heel is the finish. Let's be clear, there's nothing major here, just some annoying errors. Both the plain green and black is neatly applied, although it doesn't have the same lustre and sheen as, say, a Bachmann or Hornby model. Both BR 'cycling lion' and 'ferret and dartboard' emblems are good,

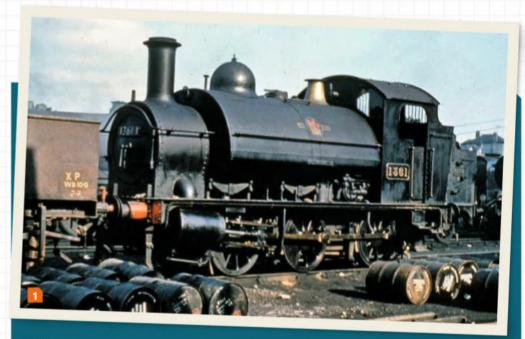

# History

The '1361' owes its distinctive shape to the Sharp Stewart 0-6-0STs inherited from the Cornish Minerals Railway. They were built in the 1870s, but by the turn of the 20th century they were a bit long in the tooth. Churchward tasked his deputy, Harold Holcroft, to design a replacement. The result, introduced in 1910, was a virtual copy, even down to the Allan valvegear, but with standard GWR fittings.

The five '1361s', Nos. 1361-65, were built in 1910. They worked on docksides and in yards, and were frequently employed as yard or depot pilots. Often

allocated to sheds in Devon and Cornwall (St Blazey, Laira, Plymouth Millbay or Newton Abbot), Nos. 1361, 1364 and 1365 were withdrawn from Swindon, while No. 1362 ended its days at Taunton. All five were withdrawn in 1961/62.

No. 1363 was saved by the Great Western Society, and after a spell at Totnes it moved to Didcot Railway Centre. It is under a full overhaul to working order. Kernow is to donate £5 from every 'OO' gauge No. 1363 sold to the GWS. but not as fine as those from other manufacturers. The biggest let-down on the BR models is the shape of the smokebox door numberplate (too wide and too shallow) and that the digits are clearly in the wrong typeface.

On GWR No. 1364, the letters are a bit too fat - they look stretched somehow - and lack the black shading. No. 1364 has its number painted on the bufferbeam, but in the same typeface as the cabside numberplate. This is incorrect - GWR bufferbeam numbers used what can only be described as a 'sans serif' typeface.

The \$64,000 question is: has Kernow/DJM given us a model that's better than the Heljan '1361'? Both models have their issues and if it wasn't for those splashers, it would be a resounding 'yes'. On balance, the Kernow model just edges ahead, purely because the Danish offering didn't have the same level of detailing and refinement.

There's another plus point to Kernow's model: it's cheaper!
Heljan's model has an RRP of £159.95, whereas Kernow's has an RRP of £134.99. And that's before you take into account the fact that Kernow is offering its model for just £124.99. (RF)

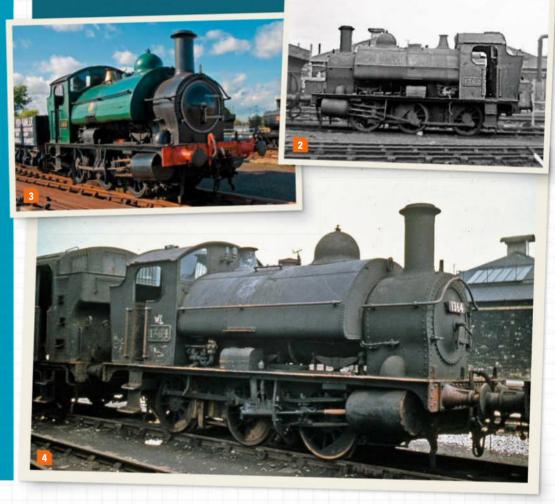

# RealTrack Class 156 DMU

ack in the mid-1980s, with an array of new trains coming on stream, BR was excelling itself with press 'jollies' to show off its new equipment. My colleagues on *Modern Railways* magazine had more junkets than they could cope with, so some got passed onto *Model Railway Constructor* and I got sent on some nice days out.

In particular, I recall an inaugural trip from Derby on a West Yorkshire PTE Class 155 and a joint BR and AA outing from Birmingham, over the Central Wales line in a new Metro-Cammell Class 156 DMU. I have to say that, just as Met-Camm's first generation

DMUs were a cut above the Derby equivalent, so the Class 156 was a smoother, quieter ride than the Derby-built Class 155.

Though neither class ever ran on my home stamping ground, I did develop a soft spot for the Class 156. I have two Lima models, one as the West Highland unit Bonnie Prince Charlie which I saw several times while on holiday in Oban, and the other in my own bogus MacBrayne's bus livery, done at the time when bus operators were starting to take over train franchises.

# EARLY VERSION

The Lima model was released in 1989, not long after the real units, and it was compromised by Lima's standard mechanism with a transverse 'pancake' motor driving one bogie through spur gears. This mechanism relied on traction tyres and substantial weight, so the underframe detail was largely sacrificed to a plastic box, with basic detail, which housed a section of steel bar.

When Charlie and Arran at RealTrack released the news that they were working with Rapido Trains on a new Class 156, I knew that this would be a model with lots of appeal.

The first deliveries of the RealTrack model are now arriving in the UK and we've been loaned an example in ScotRail's current 'Saltire' livery for review. RealTrack is offering the Class 156



in three forms in each livery, a basic analog version, a DCC decoder-fitted version and a DCC sound-fitted version. Much as I would have liked to review the 'top of the range' model, it was in fact the analog version of 156494 which was submitted for review. The level of detail and finish is the



same for all versions, however.

With its mechanical geometry derived from Rapido's Budd RDC railcar, the Class 156 has both vehicles powered by a small motor placed under the floor. As the Budd car comes with dire warnings about the risk of over-stressing the motor by hauling unpowered dummy cars, I was quick to check if the '156' carries any similar warnings. It doesn't, so presumably either the motors are more powerful, or the fears of damage to the RDCs were unfounded

The Class 156 units are formed of two almost identical vehicles which only differ in that one has a toilet behind the driver's cab and the other doesn't. The full-size Class 156 is driven by an underfloor diesel engine powering both axles of the bogie at the opposite end from the driving cab. Class 156s are in use by train operators from ScotRail southwards to the East Midlands, but they are not normally seen in the south and south-west of England.

# MIXED IMPRESSIONS

The Class 156 is supplied in a handsome black cardboard box lined with foam and with the two cars cased in the now obligatory clear plastic sleeves. The immediate impression is that the ScotRail 'Saltire' livery (I believe it's been nicknamed 'SpotRail') with its vast array of spots in assorted sizes has

# Pertormance

On test, the Class 156 was smooth and quiet straight from the box. Indeed, it's an impressive runner and it quickly sets aside less-than-fond memories of trying to get the Lima model to run smoothly. It operates well throughout the speed range and is all but impossible to stall, thanks to the spread of pick-ups over its 2ft length. Even without sound, there's a satisfying 'roar' from the wheels and a good click of metal wheels on rail joints - but our test track does have pretty minimal sound insulation.

On the analog version, saloon lights and directional front and rear lights are all on, and of constant brightness, regardless of speed. Cab lights and destination displays are also on. The destinations (Glasgow Ce and Newcastle) appear to be set back behind the glazing and on our sample, one destination showed up much more brightly than the other, regardless of speed.

been very well reproduced.

Beyond that, we have to remember that we're looking at a £220 unit which is effectively two powered vehicles at £110 each. That's not a huge price by today's standards, but set against the hype that accompanied the launch of this model, does it live up to expectations?

I'm not entirely sure. 'Disappointed' is too strong a word, but the 'wow factor' that was present when I saw the Class 143 isn't there with the Class 156. I'm not sure why I feel that way. but the more I looked the more I became convinced that the Class 156 is a good model but not a great one. Perhaps it's just that Rapido's APT-E is a very difficult act to follow.

Let's get the negatives out of the way at the start. On our sample, on both cars, there was an assembly issue. The front left-hand wheelset was not located in its bearing. It only took a moment to snap it back into place but it did alert me to the delicate, almost flimsy, nature of the bogies. While the livery application on the sides and ends is excellent, the roof gives the impression of being self-coloured plastic. It may be sprayed over it's impossible to tell without scratching the model and as this was a loaned sample, I could not do that. Fact remains, sprayed or not sprayed, it looks self-coloured.

Open it up and although the manufacturer has avoided the substantially raised floor that was >

evident in Dapol's recent DMUs, the floor is still slightly raised and the floor/seat unit is a one-niece moulding in lurid purple plastic. At least Dapol's seats were finished in a different colour from the floor. Only the tables and the saloon bulkheads are separate fittings. One bulkhead on our sample had come loose, and I could not see where it was meant to be fitted.

## LOTS OF PLUSES

What's really good about the Class 156? Almost everything else. The model captures the

long pencil-smooth nature of the prototype - such a sharp contrast to the contemporary Class 155, which was all flat sides, square corners and riveted panels. The character of the '156' is well captured by the ends and the distinctive long, rectangular side windows with their chromed toplights. The plain, ribbed roof carries the cab-to-shore radio pod and the toilet-fitted car has an additional vent over the toilet compartment. On the inner end of both cars, the icing on the cake is the heat shield over the

exhaust pipe. This appears to be an etched stainless steel fitting and the tiny perforations are a real work of art.

There are separately fitted plastic handrails and clear light lenses for more than just the direction-controlled head and tail lights. The centrally placed door warning lights also have clear lenses, and on the DCC versions these can be made to flash before departure. Indeed. on the sound-fitted version they will operate in concert with the 'doors closing' bleeper, which the instructions refer to as the 'hustle alarm'.

In every respect, the RealTrack model is a giant leap forward from the old Lima model, which is now part of the Hornby range. Rapido's Jason Shron originally hinted at the inclusion of a detailed toilet compartment, despite the fact that you wouldn't be able to see it through the frosted window. Sure enough, toilet and wash basin are present, and while you can't see it from outside, if you buy the sound-fitted version, there's even a toilet-flush function so you can certainly hear it!

Unlike the Dapol DMU, which has circuit boards at both floor and ceiling level, Rapido has concentrated all the electronics on a board housed within the roof area. This carries the saloon lights, door warning lights and cab and destination screen LEDs. There are, however, no switches to operate optional lights under analog control, so if you want all the lighting functions you need to buy a DCC-equipped model. A detailing pack contains additional windscreen wipers (to replace those lost on your layout), obstacle deflectors (snowploughs), BSI couplings and the roof pod for Radio Electronic Token Block signalling).

# **UP AND UNDER**

If you've become accustomed to the Lima/Hornby model's box underframe, the underside of the RealTrack model is likely to be a source of some fascination. I've no idea if everything is in accordance with the prototype, but I suspect if you've studied the underside of the Class 156 you'll find little that's missing. True, the underside of the fuel tank is full of holes, but that's just because it houses the speaker on the DCC sound-equipped version.

Engine, battery boxes and alternator are all present and several items are finished in orange or silver, as they would be on the real thing when it was ex-works. The engine end of the exhaust is in red oxide, and where it emerges at the end of the unit it is painted silver and partially hidden by those splendid heat shields.

The air-sprung bogies are quite delicate and have brake detail in line with the wheels and

# **Additional DCC information**

There are DCC-fitted and DCC sound-fitted models available at £260 and £330 respectively. These were not supplied for review, but RealTrack's Charlie Petty provided the following information.

The DCC-fitted model has two 21-pin decoders. Two ESU 53614 LokPilot pre-programmed decoders are fitted, which feature the following functions:

F0: Daytime running on headlights.

F1: Night time running on headlights.

**F2:** Interior lights on/off.

F3: Passenger side door open indicators.

F4: Destination blind on/off.

F5: Directional cab light on/off.

F6: Parking Mode (twin red light at both ends) When F0 and F1 are off.

On the DCC Sound-fitted version, two 21-pin LokSound Select decoders are used. The functions on these are as follows:

FO: Front headlights on daytime running. (If F20 is off).

F1: Engines start/stop (separate start-up on both cars).

F2: Playable high horn (only on leading vehicle).

F3: Playable low horn (only on leading vehicle).

F4: Passenger door open/close (Operates the working door lights. On closing, the lead car goes off first, followed by the rear car, as per the prototype)

F5: Brake application when moving/ brake dump when stationary.

F6: Driver's door open/close sound

F7: Compressor speed-up (Engine revs up to produce air for the braking system) as per the prototype)

F8: Toilet discharge

F9: Variable speed flange squeal

F10: Dispatch whistle

F11: Guard to Driver buzzer

F12: Passenger lighting on/off (With fluorescent light flicker)

F13: Directional destination blind light

F14: Automatic coupling/uncoupling sounds

F15: Parking red lights (If F0 and F20 are off)

F16: PA

announce-

ments (CV Changeable) eight different destinations.

**F17:** PA announcements (CV Changeable) eight different to the above destinations.

F18: Track detonators (This three-bang stop signal is speed dependent. When going slowly the bangs are spaced out, going quickly the bangs are faster).

F19: Directional cab light on/off (This being a bulb they fade out) if left on, they switch off in the leading cab automatically when the unit moves).

F20: Night time running (If F0 is off).

F21: Webasto carriage heater.



separately fitted speedometer drive. The metal wheelsets are on insulated axles and run in phosphor-bronze bearing strips mounted behind the bogie sideframes. These provide friction-free current collection and dispense with the need for wiper pick-ups. A bar coupling between the two cars, similar to that used in Bachmann multiple units, provides for current collection to both cars from all wheels. However, this is not the Bachmann-style wired coupling, with its numerous electrical connections in order to use a single DCC decoder.

RealTrack has gone for a technologically simpler but more expensive option of twin 21-pin DCC decoders, one in each car. Which is better? It's swings and roundabouts really. Bachmann's wired couplings are more labour-intensive and expensive aspects to assemble multiple units, whether analog or DCC. RealTrack's twin decoder arrangement means that only DCC users bear additional expense.

# WITH SPOTS ON

The ScotRail livery and stylised 'Saltire' logos, all formed

from dozens of spots in pale blue and white, are well applied over the dark blue base colour. Tiny but legible markings include FirstGroup's very discreet 'ScotRail is operated by First' on the doors, 'Main reservoir' and 'Door reservoir' labels, cycle logo, and overhead live wire warning signs. Even the unique typeface used for the numbers on 156494 has been correctly reproduced.

Overall, this is another top-notch multiple unit from a manufacturer which seems to have made DMUs its speciality. It's good to see a second

generation unit modelled to 21st-century standards, but there's little doubt in my mind that DCC sound now adds that 'wow factor'.

More liveries are to follow, and I understand some versions of the present ScotRail model have already sold out. (CJL)

# Heljan Class 05

eljan's 4mm scale
Class 05, released in
late 2015, received
many plaudits for
its accuracy, looks and
performance. Indeed, a few
commentators described it as the
Danish manufacturer's best UK
diesel-outline model to date.
Now, a 7mm scale version has
arrived and it's every bit as
impressive, if not better than,
its 'OO' predecessor.

Although their BR careers were relatively short, many '05s' were given a second chance in industrial use and this is reflected in Heljan's livery options. As well as BR green (with and without 'wasp' stripes)

and blue, there's a choice between NCB green, CEGB yellow and unbranded maroon.

Received for review is the eye-catching yellow version, wearing the iconic 1970/80s logos of the erstwhile Central Electricity Generating Board (CEGB). No number is carried, nor are any other embellishments applied, allowing modellers plenty of scope for customisation.

As with the preceding Class 45 'Peak', Heljan's revised packaging for 7mm scale diesels features the '05' screwed to an attractive wooden plinth, encased in a foam-padded card box, making extraction a simple job.

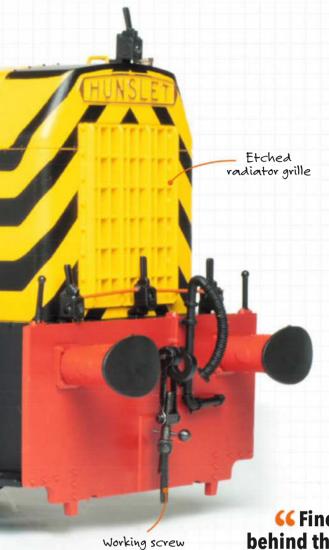
Our sample arrived from China, via Denmark, in immaculate condition, proving the effectiveness of this enclosure.

# FITAND FINISH

In terms of packaging, Heljan has done a great job of squeezing plenty of detail into this model, while retaining a sensible price. First impressions are positive: the striking CEGB yellow livery has been been applied without any visible flaws and the 'wasp' stripes are crisply defined. The big 'e' logos are also finely printed, although the builder's plates on the cab doors feature no lettering, which is a shame.

The prototype's enormous cab windows are hard to ignore, and one's gaze is immediately drawn to the interior, which is detailed with a full array of control gear. Closer inspection reveals that there's also plenty of moulded relief on the front and rear bulkheads, along with the planked floor. Cable conduit, wiper motors, fuel and oil gauges are all present and the ribbed, padded seats look inviting. There's even a pair of radiators for the footplate team.

Moving away from the cab, the level of finesse around the bonnet, roof and radiator grille is impressive. Finely etched metal mesh sits behind the radiator louvre, creating an authentic sense of depth. Small details, such as Hunslet nameplates on the nose ends, air horns, windscreen wipers, handrails, radiator filler cap and lamp brackets are all faithfully reproduced. Below the running plate, the spoked wheels are

attractive and the jack shaft and coupling rods look very much the part, while sanding pipes, air tanks and brake gear are accurately portrayed.

In a welcome improvement from all previous 7mm releases, Heljan now provides a 21-pin DCC decoder socket on the main circuit board, making for simple digital conversion. There's also a 20mm diameter speaker aperture cast into the front of the chassis block, allowing sound to be emitted through the radiator grille.

Accessing the interior is simple: remove six screws from beneath the footplate and the cab and bonnet lift away, revealing the circuit board and motor housing. I found that the cab interior was best accessed from above, with the roof being lightly glued to the body at each corner; gentle pressure was enough to dislodge it. With the 'lid' off, the full glory of

the interior can be better appreciated – adding a driver is an essential upgrade.

On the tracks, the little

# History

The history of the Class 05 is a complicated one, with the design evolving significantly over a six-year building programme. Built for British Railways by the Hunslet Engine Company of Leeds, the first example appeared in 1955. The design was altered significantly part-way through the building programme, switching to a larger wheel diameter and increased overall height. Further tinkering took place with this second version, leading to a revised pattern of radiator grilles and cab windows. Whereas both versions of the second Class 05 batch were offered by Heljan in 'OO' gauge, just the first - Type A - is currently on offer in 'O', depicting D2574-D2584.

# BIGGER, YET EVEN BETTER

This is a fine model in terms of looks, specification and performance. Heljan has really captured the look of the real thing, with admirable attention to detail. With a reasonable price tag, it offers good value for money too. This handsome little engine is sure to appeal to modellers of the BR transition era, as well as 1970/80s aficionados and fans of industrial railways. All it lacks is a suitable footplate crew in that cavernous cab! (GD)

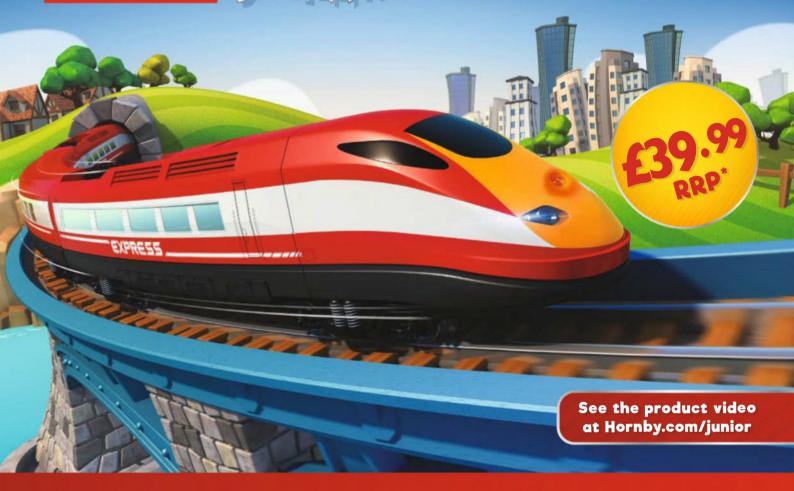

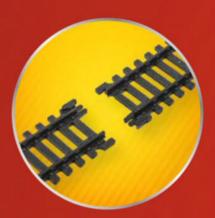

# Graham Farish Class 40

he English Electric
Class 40 has been in the
Graham Farish range
since 1986. It was given
a five-pole motor by Bachmann
in 2004, but it retained the boxy,
somewhat squashed body
tooling. Such an important
prototype demanded a model to
modern standards, and its
all-new Class 40 reflects the
huge improvements made in
'N' gauge models since Graham
Farish was taken over by
Bachmann some 17 years ago.

Four Class 40s feature in the first run: D211 Mauretania in plain green livery with disc headcodes, D369 in green with half-yellow ends and centre headcode box, and 40141 in BR blue with split headcodes and sound. We received 40159 in BR blue with

centre headcode box for review.

Dimensionally, the new model is pretty much spot-on when compared to published prototype dimensions, unlike its predecessor model. The bodyshell is wellmoulded with neatly rendered cant rail and bodyside grilles (though the vertical centre rib in the bodyside louvre is perhaps a little too prominent). The roof fan is very subtly moulded with a representation of the blades underneath. Some recent Farish models have featured photoetched roof grilles, but in 'N' the mesh can be a little overscale. Here, the moulded effect is very pleasing and, in my view, is unlikely to disappoint.

The distinctive three-panel windscreen and nose capture the look of the prototype and the nose

handrails are separate wire parts. The door handrails are moulded, but this gives them a finesse that wire components in this area would be unlikely to match.

# **DETAIL DELIGHTS**

The model features a number of neat touches: the chassis block has been painted so that interior details - including grey and orange conduits - show through the glazed side windows, while the bits bag includes a blanking panel for the steam heating port on the roof.

As D359, 40159 was fitted with a Clayton steam-heating boiler. This means that it has a circular boiler exhaust port on the roof, whereas D200-259/267-286/305-324 were fitted with Stones-Vapor boilers



and had rectangular ports.

Bachmann has tooled this version. A very fine photo-etched and pre-printed frost grille, with the correct hexagonal pattern apertures, is also included for the end user to fit.

The model manufacturer has also done its homework, as 40159 has the correct long-long-short

arrangement of cant rail grilles and side-access door of the Clayton-boiler fitted '40s'.

# SATIN FINISH

The model is very well painted and lettered, with a smooth satin finish. *Model Rail* has previously noted the excellent shade of BR blue used on Farish models and the '40' is no exception. The yellow on the nose ends is equally

fine and well applied. All lettering is crisp and legible, with the correct Rail Alphabet typeface used, and the printed English Electric worksplates above the BR arrows are a neat touch.

The bogies are well rendered and the pony wheel is, correctly, of a smaller diameter than the drivers. The leaf springs appear very slightly lacking in relief, but weathering the bogies

and emphasising the details with a black wash would enhance this area considerably. It is often the case that shadows on the prototype make such features appear more pronounced than they are.

Speedometer cables are factory-fitted, and numerous small gauges and pipes have been separately painted, though the tanks, just visible below the body and above the underframe boxes, would have been better if they'd been picked out in grey.

# **OPTIONAL EXTRAS**

# **History**

The English Electric Type 4, later designated Class 40 under TOPS, was one of the first large locomotives to be ordered by BR under the modernisation plan of the 1950s. Some 200 were delivered between 1958 and 1962 with the power unit and bogie design, initially, being derived from Oliver Bulleid's experimental diesel 10203, built for the Southern Region. Ironically, the Class 40s were rare visitors to southern metals in service, being more associated with the London Midland, Eastern and Scottish regions.

The first 125 were delivered with disc headcodes, the next 20 with split alphanumeric headcode boxes, then, when the decision was taken to abandon gangway doors between locomotives, the remaining 55 were built with centre headcode boxes. Centre headcodes were

retro-fitted to some of the original batch. By the late 1970s, headcode numbers were no longer displayed and most locomotives either had them plated over, or simply showed a pair of white dots.

Nicknamed 'Whistlers', the '40s' were

initially used on top link express services on Great Eastern and London Midland routes. However, the arrival of more powerful 'Deltics' and Class 47s relegated them to secondary passenger services and freight trains

The locomotives were delivered in green with grey roofs. To reflect their use on express services to the city, the London Midland region named some after vessels belonging to Liverpool-based shipping lines, such as Cunard.

After a gradual run-down of the fleet, the last '40s' were withdrawn in January 1985. However, four were reinstated as Class 97/4s for departmental work around Crewe, while pioneer 40122 (D200) was retained for rail tour duties

The last '97/4' was withdrawn in 1987 and D200 was presented to the National Railway Museum in 1988. Alongside D200, six other Class 40s survive: 40012, 40013, 40106, 40118, 40135 and 40145.

has to be removed to do this).

The review model represents the locomotive as it was in the late 1970s, by which time some items of working equipment had been removed. I fitted these details for the purposes of this review and, while fiddly, they significantly enhance the appearance. Fine tweezers - and some patience - are needed to fit these parts. The manufacturer recommends the use of PVA-type glue to avoid damaging any paintwork.

The body can be unclipped according to the instructions to permit the fitting of a DCC decoder; the chassis is of a very elegant design with very few 'loose' wires. All models are factory-fitted with a speaker (this adds a negligible amount to the cost) but this does mean that upgrading to a sound model simply requires the addition of

a chip. The DCC sound version will also work with limited functionality on 12V DC.

# **CAPABLE MODEL**

Under analogue control, and after a period of running-in, as specified in the instruction sheet supplied, the model's performance is smooth and powerful and it was able to easily cope with anything (scaled down) that the prototype could manage.

Like the prototype, the model has six powered axles; the pony wheels at the ends of each bogie are idlers and are permitted

a considerable amount of lateral movement to ensure the model can cope with tighter-thanprototype curves. It had no trouble with first radius curves on the test track.

With the excellent quality of the body mouldings, printing and painting, and the stylishly designed chassis with all wires neatly channelled and the speaker fitted as standard, this model is a very significant improvement over its predecessor and a fitting model of one of British Railways' most popular and long-serving diesel types. # The guest chairman

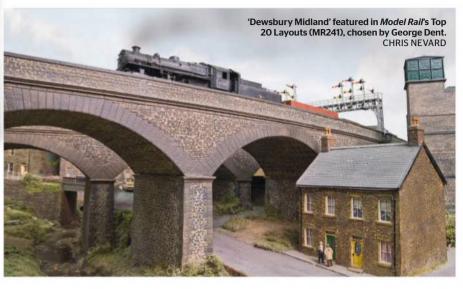
Manchester MRS' Ralph Robertson chairs the Model Rail club room this month and counts down the days before this year's Christmas Model Railway Show.

odel railways have come a long way since 1925. The Manchester Model Railway Club was formed by Arch Dean, who placed an advert in *Model Railway News* - which was also in its infancy. Meetings were initially held at the Clarion Café in Manchester, but by 1950 the Manchester Model Railway Society (as it was known by then) had its own clubhouse alongside Old Trafford railway station.

During the 1940s and 1950s, some of our members moved away from 'O' gauge and started to work in 4mm, using a new track gauge of 18mm. They also developed their own wheel standards (the Manchester Profile), which had more accurate wheel flanges than those offered by model manufacturers at the time.

Because nothing was available commercially, everything had to be built from scratch; names like John Langan, Sid Stubbs and Alex Jackson regularly contributed magazine



articles covering topics like making wheels and developing the (by this point) famous AJ coupling. Models were often entirely scratchbuilt, including the motors and wheels, and we are still in possession of many fine models built by these skilled modellers.

From 1938, the club was privileged to have Sir William A. Stanier as honorary president, a position he held until his death in 1965. Since then, the title has been bestowed on members who have demonstrated exemplary service to the society.

Since 1970, an old church, Dean Hall, has been our headquarters. It has two floors and we have a well-equipped workshop and a superb library. Currently, we own six layouts in scales ranging from 'O' gauge to 'N' gauge, with a 'P4' and American 'HO' layout too.

Our flagship layout is 'Dewsbury Midland', and we are very proud to have it included in *Model Rail*'s Top 20 Layouts in MR241. This layout, along with past layouts like our '2FS' layout 'Chee Tor', have been exhibited around the country (and in some cases abroad), winning many awards.

Each year we host our annual exhibition in the centre of Manchester; 2017 marks our 80th show and is held at the Barnes Wallis Building in the first weekend of December. At the show we host our annual competition and encourage members to enter models in various categories.

Throughout the year we try to help members improve their model making skills by offering various courses. These range from soldering to 3D printing, and (more recently) CAD skills too.

The clubroom is open two afternoons and three evenings per week, and there is always something happening and plenty to learn. Each month we have a more formal meeting where we present various topics, either of a modelling or prototype interest.

If you live in the area or are visiting we'd be pleased to show you around. We will also have our own stand at The Christmas MRS, so please come along and chat.

# **Trains and treats**

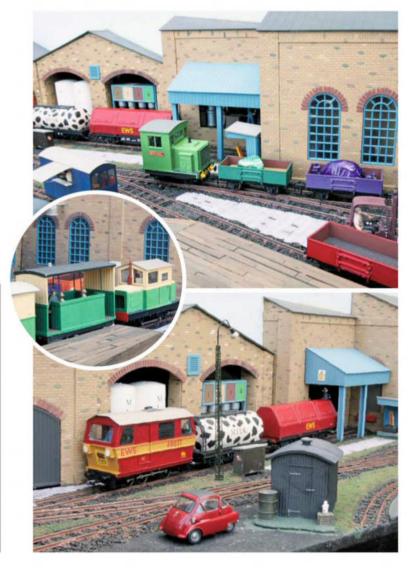
'Quality Street' is a rail-served chocolate factory. The layout is 7mm narrow gauge and runs on standard 16.5mm, 'OO' gauge track ('O-16.5'). The 7ft by 18in track plan is inspired by the famous inglenook format, with the addition of a freight and passenger train, which adds to the fun.

The factory makes eight different types of chocolate, but only five per shift. Before starting a shift, the supervisor has to select five cards at random; these cards determine the chocolates that will be produced and in what order.

The layout contains eight wagons, each painted the colour of an individual chocolate. As an additional challenge, each chocolate has to be loaded into the wagon of corresponding colour. The train is then assembled in the same order that the cards were drawn - this can be quite difficult, so at exhibitions we often select just three cards.

# Operating sequence...

- 1. Passenger train transports staff to the factory.
- 2. Freight train arrives and is shunted into the ingredients siding.
- 3. Empty coaches from the passenger train depart.
- 4. Five empty wagons arrive having been used to deliver yesterday's output.
- 5. Factory gates are closed for security. All shunting is now carried out in the factory yard.
- 6. The day's produce is ready for loading. Wagons are shunted into the dispatch bay (one at a time) and loaded with the corresponding chocolates.
- Wagons are formed into a train in the order that the cards were drawn.
- 8. Factory gates open and the loaded train departs.
- 9. Empty passenger train arrives.
- 10. Empty freight train departs.
- 11. Workers go home in the passenger train.

## Present your case

If there's a locomotive that you think needs to be offered ready-to-run, here's the place to voice your opinion...

Locomotive: GWR 'Manor' 4-6-0

Gauge: '00'

Proposed by: Richard Foster

It's easy to see why Warner Brothers wanted a GWR 4-6-0 to haul trains to Hogwarts. Despite your allegiance,

there's no getting away from the fact that they look how you imagine a steam locomotive should look. The GWR has a huge enthusiast following, and most of its classic 4-6-0s are offered ready-to-run, and to the latest standards.

So it's a bit of a surprise that one of the most popular GWR 4-6-0s, the 'Manor', isn't part of anyone's 'OO' gauge catalogue and that the last offering, from Bachmann in 2006, was essentially the ex-Mainline model from 1980. It was a good model for its day, but it lags behind the standard now set by Bachmann, Hornby and others.

The real thing wasn't as successful a design as, say, the 'Hall' or the 'Grange', but Charles Collett's pretty 4-6-0 made itself at home on some really wonderful bits of railway, most notably the ex-GWR and ex-Cambrian lines in Wales.

Click through Geoff Plumb's wonderful collection of Cambrian images (https://plumbloco.smugmug.com/Trains/Cambrian-CoastLines or quick link: https://goo.gl/JYB9VN) and you'll see that every locomotive featured, from the '58XX' to the Standard '4MT' 4-6-0, is available in 'OO' to modern standards - except the 'Manor.

Surely it's time to put that right?

#### What is it?

Weight restrictions on key secondary lines, such as the Cambrian, prolonged the life of older, lighter locomotives, which had become life-expired by the mid-1930s. GWR Chief Mechanical Engineer Charles Collett designed a solution, which was effectively his 'Grange' 4-6-0 with 5ft 8in diameter driving wheels but with a smaller, lighter boiler.

Swindon built 20 in 1938/39, which incorpo-



rated parts from withdrawn '43XX' 2-6-0s.
BR ordered ten more in 1950.

Although the Cambrian was their main area of work, 'Manors' also found use in the London Division, on the old Midland & South Western Junction and in the West Country. Steaming issues were largely cured and the last were withdrawn in December 1965.

#### Is it viable?

Detail differences would require only minimal tooling changes, such as the different chimney types that the class carried. That would make a new model fairly economical to produce.

There could be quite a few liveries: those with GWR 'shirtbutton' and GWR initials, as well as BR black and BR lined green. There are a couple of oddball liveries which would work well as limited editions: full 1920s coat of arms livery, as carried by BR-built No. 7827 *Lydham Manor* at the Paignton & Dartmouth in the 1980s, as well as No. 7816 *Frilsham Manor*, which acquired a heavily weathered tender that still bore the initials GWR until its withdrawal in November 1965.

#### Can I see a real one?

Nine were preserved: Nos. 7802 Bradley Manor and 7812 Erlestoke Manor at the Severn Valley Railway, No. 7808 Cookham Manor at Didcot Railway Centre and No. 7819 Hinton Manor is displayed at the McArthurGlen Designer Outlets in Swindon. Nos. 7820 Dinmore Manor, 7821 Ditcheat Manor and 7822 Foxcote Manor survive at the Gloucestershire Warwickshire, West Somerset and Llangollen railways respectively, while Nos. 7827 Lydham Manor and 7828 Odney Manor are in service at the Dartmouth Steam Railway and West Somerset Railway.

On the day, we raised £250 for Wood Street Mission, a charity that helps disadvantaged children in Manchester and Salford.

Built at Ross-on-Wye, the new Lyn captures the character of her 'Yankee' ancestor.

I have enough projects to occupy me 24/7 at the moment, but I took a long weekend to go to North Devon, make amends with the Lynton & Barnstaple Railway, and collect a Heljan Manning Wardle from the Woody Bay shop. I say 'make amends' because, 35 years ago, when I wrote Portrait of the Lynton & Barnstaple Railway, I commented that I didn't feel their efforts, with a 'spluttering petrol tractor and old industrial track' would do the L&B justice. Well, on September 29, 82 years to the day since North Devon's wonderful narrow gauge railway 'fell asleep', it had awakened and the only petrol tractor was in a farming display. Standing in Woody Bay station at the head of four 'replica' coaches, each of which is built around some original sections or components, was Baldwin 2-4-2T No. 762 Lyn. In fact, it's a replica of the 1898-built American locomotive known on the L&B as 'the Yankee', but it's the last major step in giving the revived L&B its first 'proper' train. I kept having to pinch myself

to be sure I wasn't dreaming. I never thought I'd see a genuine L&B train in its rightful setting in my lifetime.

At Chelfham, inside the ugly 1960s extension, the original front wall has been completely renovated. Once the gutters are fitted, the extension will be pulled down.

Maybe I'm now old-fashioned, but while I am lost in admiration for the currently popular diorama-type models with their incredibly high quality, I can't help still liking a good quality continuous-run layout in either 'OO' or 'N'. And of the hundreds of layouts MR has featured, my favourite has to be 'Tetleys Mills', by the late Dave Shakespeare. We couldn't have hoped for a better first-issue layout - it used largely RTR models on proprietary track and so didn't demand scratchbuilding locomotive and track skills, which the mass market we were aiming at simply didn't have the time or inclination for, in our view.

But Dave's empathy with the northern townscape of soot-covered millstone grit buildings blew me away. His intoxicating mixture of houses, pubs, factories, cobbled streets, canals and viaducts was utterly convincing. Bend down to street level to see the viaduct, canal and mill chimneys and it made you feel as though you were in a Colin Gifford photograph. It set the perfect standard for what *Model Rail* wanted to do, and to this day it remains my favourite all-time MR layout. I know Dave would have been tickled pink.

Since then, MR's coverage has improved exponentially in quality and I marvel at

Peter Marriott's amazing scenery, am consistently amazed by the quality and value for money (yes, really!) of RTR models and I remain baffled beyond words by digital control! When I retire (not just yet) I shall hope to explore further - guided, naturally, by *Model Rail*.

And none of it would have happened without the confidence, guidance and dogged determination of Clive Nicholls, whose drive to launch this magazine two decades ago has never been fully acknowledged. If 20 years isn't too late to put this right - cheers Clive.

Here's to the next couple of decades!

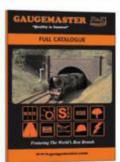
